

GELANE FINALLY FIRES MFEREZIYAMTHOBA

IT is now official, outspoken KoNtshingila Indvuna Mfeneziyamthoba Magagula has been removed from the position.

When announcing his removal from the position he held for years, Acting Chief, Inkhosatane Gelane Zwane minced no words saying Magagula was now behaving like he was the 'chief' of the area and failed to accord her any respect.

She said the last straw was when Magagula used the media as his battle field to attack her, something that pushed her to the decision to fire him.

Zwane said she took the decision after realising that there were now serious differences between her and Magagula in the way he was executing his role.

She said as there was a saying that:

 You might have been aware that he then resorted to using the media to fight me. I have therefore decided to have him removed instead of the two of us looking like we are equals.

Failed

Magagula was removed in absentia as he failed to be part of the meeting and no clear reasons were given why he opted not to attend as others claimed they came across him driving towards the Manzini direction early in the morning.

After all has been said and done, Magagula is now an ordinary subject.

Inkhosatana Gelane in a well

attended meeting at Nhlambeni which is a mini chiefdom near Sibetsamoya, announced that after realising that Magagula was now thickheaded and a law unto himself, she has resolved to remove him.

Close to 1000 residents attended the meeting where Zwane axed Magagula.

"Besekunguye lophetse mine. Tinkunzi letimbili atihlalelani ngako waMagagula kufike esincumeni kutsi ngimehlise," the now healthy looking Zwane said when announcing the removal of Magagula.

Troubled

Zwane who was accompanied by senior members of the ruling KoNtshingila household said she was troubled a lot when she learned that a number of people were allocated land without the KaGwegwe leadership's knowledge.

Zwane did not announce a replacement for Magagula but only mentioned that senior Indvuna of KaGwegwe Mageza Mazibuko was to frequent the area and work on appointing 'libandla' which would report to the main royal residence, KaGwegwe.

Two new 'Ponzi schemes' hit our shores

BARELY two months after Swazis have been hard hit by the MMM Ponzi scheme from South Africa that saw their 'donated' monies being frozen and eventually being lost, a number of women are now flocking to join two other Ponzi schemes dubbed the Big Buxx Swaziland and **Empowerment Gener.**


The schemes promise its members five times the money contributed in not more than a week.

Big Buxx Swaziland and Empowerment Gener are about a month old and have been born after the failure of the infamous MMM from RSA.

A number of the MMM members have jumped ship after the Ponzi scheme which they defended so much ripped them off and left them high and dry.

The freezing and losing of their MMM 'mavros' as they dubbed their currency did not dampen the love for 'get-rich-quick- schemes' as they have been quick to jump

One of the managers of the Big Buxx Swaziland who wanted her identity to be anonymous said "Big Buxx Swaziland is a clone of Big Buxx South Africa, after the collapse of MMM we saw South Africans inviting us to join the Big Buxx South Africa on social media as they did with MMM. After taking some time to look at how their 'stokvel' work we realised that their process was easy and doable,



but instead of joining them we opted to opening our own Big Buxx Swaziland, with a network of people who are in our locality".

Transparent

"The rules are simple and everything is transparent, the money exchange is done for all to see, every transaction is done in the open and our members are aware of what is going on with their money. Our transactions happen on a whatsApp group. All our members are required to have either the mobile money service or have a First National Bank account so they can utilise the e-wallet service when making payments" she said.

The two Ponzi schemes are circulating the same message which looks like this; "Stage one, you pay your 'upliner' E500, on the next list you get paid E500 x 5 = E2 500. You keep E1000 upgrade E1 500 to your manager allocated to you. Stage two, on the next list you get paid E1 500 x 5 = E7 500 as a manager. You keep E6 000 and donate E1000 in the Big Buxx Swaziland account to boost the 'downliners'. You then start the cycle again with E500 as a 'downliner' and the cycle continues"

The 'dowliners', who are new members are required to readily have the E500 in their accounts so that they can immediately deposit the money once their names are allocated to deposit money to an

The cycle is said to rotate faster if members recruit more people to join the illegal scheme.

Members

A glimpse at Big Buxx Swaziland's whatsApp group, the communication network is like a highway, 'managers' posting names of members to be paid (upliner) with names of five members to pay (downliner), other members were lamenting that they haven't received their pay from all the downliners, with others complaining that it has been a while since they paid the E500 yet they have not been allocated people to pay them to managers calling for members to recruit more people so the cycle can be faster.

Just like MMM members, Big Buxx Swaziland and **Empowerment Gener members** who have already been paid are vouching at the authenticity of the Ponzi scheme.

After 13 years, Velezizweni gets new chief

After 13 years of living without a Chief the community of Velezizweni can finally breathe a sigh of relief as Prince Mboziswa was finally installed as the new Chief of the area on Saturday.

In a ceremony which was attended by thousands of community members and Chiefs from surrounding areas, Prince Mboziswa II was introduced by Inkhosikati LaShongwe as a leader of Velezizweni community. This comes long after the demise of the late Ndwandwe II in 2003. According to Mhlonipheni Shiyinkhani Msibi who is Indvuna Yenkhundla at Ngwempisi the installation of Prince Mboziswa marks a new era for the subjects of Mboziswa.

Msibi stated that living without the rightful chief proved to be a challenge for the community as there were a lot of land disputes which were unsolved.

Msibi stated that at some point in time the situation got so bad in such a way that last year bandlancane of the area was rounded up by police and put behind bars because of a land dispute issue that got out of hand. The incident saw about 40 men being arrested for demolishing a homestead.

The elated Msibi stated that he is hoping that now that there is a chief such will be a thing of the

"We are tired of bogus chiefs who were taking advantage of the situation by allocating land to people" the Headman stated.

He further added that there are three places which are very troublesome when it came to land disputes but they couldn't do anything because they do not have the right to meddle into land issues as commoners. Msibi stated that all that they are waiting for now was for the Chief to be rightfully installed by His Majesty King Mswati III as the Chief of the area.

THE Royal Swaziland Police **Hhohho Regional Commissioner** Charles Tsabedze and Assistant Superintendent Charles Simelane visited the home of the street vendor who witnessed police officers dump the late magician Mduduzi Gama.

The witness' home is situated in Mvakwelitje. The witness whose name cannot be revealed in fear of victimisation confirmed the visit by the top police officers.

However, she asked not to comment on the visit because she was now running scared. What scares her the most is that police are now frequenting her home. The visit by the top police officers came after the witness had been earlier taken to the police headquarters in Mbabane allegedly for further questioning as regards on what she saw on the fateful day.

It is not clear what exactly the two top police officers' mission was and if they did not intimidate the witness about speaking to the press.

Meanwhile, the eye witness insists she saw police vehicle dump Gama on • Witness who is a street vendor asked not to comment on the visit because she was now running scared.

Deceased preferred walking home after a night of fun

THE family of the deceased magician Mduduzi Gama have come out to state that he preferred walking home after his

This was mentioned by his younger brother Wireless Gama, who said the deceased liked to walk home from town or any other place.

"We suspect the police officers might have knocked him down with their vehicle or they beat him too much after he was found walking next to the road in the wee hours of the morning, mistaking him for a robber before dumping him at Mvakwelitje to die," he said.

"How can police officers leave a man in that state by the road

instead of taking him to hospital or keep him in their cells until he was alright," Gama questioned.

Wireless added that he strongly believes that the police know the whole truth and now they are trying to run away from it.

There is something that the police said to a journalist who was there taking pictures that still gives me sleepless nights," he said.

He mentioned that one of the police officers at the death scene threatened a journalist with death when he attempted to take pictures. "He said 'nawe ufuna sikubulale' to the journalist which raised eyebrows to many of us at the scene," he said in a sad voice.

God will punish killers, tears will flow - Family

THE distraught family of slain magician Mduduzi Gama has warned that anyone who had a hand in the death of their son will pay with his or

They will 'pray' for the death of the culprits and by so doing God will avenge for their loss.

The family said they will not only rely

on the police in bringing the suspects to book but their mode of investigation that involves prayer will be employed.

They disclosed this when this publication paid them a visit yesterday at their home in Zone 2, where they were found in a sombre mood and still finding it hard to believe what befell the magician.

Gama's little sister Neomile stated that the families of the suspects in the death of their brother will also shed a tear or two when God avenges . For now two unknown police officers are blamed for the death of Gama. They were allegedly seen by a market vendor dumping a weary Gama in the middle of the road last week. He later died.

"We are finding it hard especially now that police are denying that they dropped my brother off at Mvakwelitje, it is sad and now we will be taking matters to the next level because they have failed us in many ways," she said.

"The police have proven to us that they are hiding a lot and now

we doubt they will give us the truth hence we want to do our own investigations," Ncomile said.

The family said the deceased was a peaceful person, down to earth and could never hurt a fly, hence their belief that he was probably beaten before left on the road side by the alleged two police officers.


Emzini Wezinsizwa actor Nyembezi Kunene dies

JOHANNESBURG - Legendary actor, director and playwriter Nyembezi Kunene has died at the age of 74 following a long battle with diabetes.

The son of the Emzini Wezinsizwa veteran actor, Songoba Kunene, confirmed the news to eNCA this yesterday morning.

"It has been a terrible day so far. We have had family members and relatives coming into our household to obviously pay their last respects and to offer their message of condolences. He passed away on Saturday evening, it's still very fresh," Songoba said.

Songoba also took to Facebook in a lengthy note to pay tribute to his father. "A few hours ago, a legend departed this land. The great Nyembezi Kunene - actor, director, playwright and producer, has passed on. Following a prolonged illness, Nyemza lost his battle with Diabetes and died peacefully at the Lesedi

300 MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS SCHOOLED ON KILLER BP

BP is one of the diseases that cause a large number of deaths in the continent. About 30 percent of deaths in Sub-Saharan Africa are related to hypertension. There has been an increase in BP deaths in recent years

MEDICAL practitioners from all over the country were last Thursday schooled on the importance of correctly diagnosing hypertension (otherwise known as BP).

The tutelage was done by Professor Brian Rayner from the University of Cape Town.

The medical practitioners were advised to be on the lookout for hypertension when treating their patients.

This is because BP is one of the diseases overlooked when treating patients who are

viewed as having more serious illnesses yet it is the most dangerous.

The local medical practitioners were capacitated on the disease in a workshop organised by the ministry of health held at Sibane Hotel. Close to 300 medical practitioners attended the went.

Attention

Rayner said many chronic diseases such as kidney failure, diabetes and stroke were associated with hypertension as an underlying sickness but were sometimes not given much attention.

"BP is one of the diseases that cause a large

number of deaths in the continent. About 30 percent of deaths in Sub-Saharan Africa are related to hypertension. There has been an increase in BP deaths in recent years. A lot of medical practitioners have not yet come to understand that BP is associated with diseases like kidney failure, heart failure, stroke, cardio arrest. Deaths that are associated with BP are premature deaths and such should be avoided by you medical practitioners by proper diagnosis," he said. The professor said in Africa, Zimbabwe was the most affected country by BP in the Sub-Saharan region.

He said the prevalence of BP was not associated with the economy of a country but the way of life of the people.

"It is also the responsibility of the medical practitioners to encourage patients to live a healthy lifestyle. The patients should be made aware of the dangers of BP, the importance of medication if one has been diagnosed. It is your responsibility as medical practitioners to also educate the patients of signs of BP," he said. Rayner encouraged the medical practitioners to make sure that tests were accurate.

"If need be, you must conduct more than just

one test then make sure that your diagnosis is clear. You can take up to six tests just to be accurate," the professor added.

The professor cautioned the practitioners to be aware that a patient with diabetes had a high possibility of also suffering from BP. "The best way to fight these sicknesses is to adopt a healthy lifestyle, your patients must be constantly reminded that they need to keep fit, eat healthy, cut on sugary foods and food filled with calories, drugs and alcohol. Research reveals that 40 percent of people suffering from hypertension never get treatment and 60 percent of patients withdraw from taking their treatment," he said

He noted that the onus was on the medical practitioners to make sure they follow up on their patients so as to make sure that there were no lives lost prematurely.

Rayner said BP was not a disease that affects only adults but it also affects children and adolescents.

"With children in some cases it is because of genetic factors and most of the times it is the diet of that child. Children must be tested because early detection goes a long way as focus is then given to that particular patient. Sugary foods contribute to obesity in children and this in turn results to diabetes," he said.

Effective 6 June 2016, members of the public are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity and exchange coins dated 2013 and earlier at any of the thirty-five Swazi Post outlets countrywide.

The public is advised that the exchange for these coins will be new coins or notes, at the same value as the value presented at the Post Office (s). Each customer will be restricted to a daily transaction limit of E2 000. Any transactions above E200 will require a proof of identification. Once again, members of the public are reminded that effective 1 September 2016, the old series of coins, except for 5 cents coins, shall no longer be accepted in the market and members of the public still holding such coins shall only be able to exchange them directly with the Central Bank of Swaziland.

WHAT IS HYPERTENSION?

HYPERTENSION (HTN or HT), also known as high blood pressure (HBP), is a long term medical condition in which the blood pressure in the arteries is persistently elevated. High blood pressure usually does not cause symptoms. Long term high blood pressure, however, is a major risk factor for coronary artery disease, stroke, heart failure, peripheral vascular disease, vision loss, and chronic kidney disease

High blood pressure is classified as either primary (essential) high blood pressure or secondary high blood pressure. About 90–95% of cases are primary, defined as high blood pressure due to nonspecific lifestyle and genetic factors. Lifestyle factors that increase the risk include excess salt,

excess body weight, smoking, and alcohol. The remaining 5–10% of cases are categorized as secondary high blood pressure, defined as high blood pressure due to an identifiable cause, such as chronic kidney disease, narrowing of the kidney arteries, an endocrine disorder, or the use of birth control pills. Normal blood pressure at rest is within the range of 100–140 millimeters mercury (mmHg) systolic and 60–90 mmHg diastolic. High blood pressure is present if the resting blood pressure is persistently at or above 140/90 mmHg for most adults.

Lifestyle changes and medications can lower blood pressure and decrease the risk of health complications. Lifestyle changes include weight loss, decreased salt intake, physical exercise, and a healthy diet. If lifestyle changes are not sufficient blood pressure medications are used. (Wikipedia)

Mafitsifitsi Msibi faces E70 000 robbery charges

NOTORIOUS criminal David 'Mafitsifitsi' Msibi (62) has been charged with two counts of robbery involving property amounting to E70 000.

This comes after Msibi who was on the police 'wanted list' for crimes he committed at Luve, was arrested.

Documents presented to court stated that Msibi robbed a woman Sindisile Zubuko of her vehicle by threatening to assault her with a slasher.

He proceeded to rob the woman of money amounting to E12 000. He also robbed Mduduzi Zubuko of his items worth E32

A report by the police said Msibi was not alone when committing this offence but was with accomplices; Wonderboy Vilakati and Poolman Dlamini. Vilakati and Msibi are now in

police custody, while Dlamini is still at large.

Msibi made his court appearance last Friday before Magistrate Sebenzile Ndlela-Kunene.

He was remanded back to police custody where he awaits his next court appearance, the prosecutor made an application to conjoin Msibi's charges with those of Vilakati.

Pakistan accused fail to abide by bail conditions

NAEEM Khan Gul who was allegedly assaulted by his countrymen from Pakistan is aggrieved that his assailants have not yet compensated him for his loss as per their bail condition.

Gul was reported to have been attacked and severely assaulted by four men who were led by businessman Akber Ali, after they allegedly had misunderstandings pertaining the running of their businesses.

The four accused that included Zafar Iqbal, Wasim Ranjhi and Ehsan Ahmed were all charged with attempted murder.

They were also charged with malicious damage to property after they allegedly broke windows of a motor vehicle belonging to the complainant.

The last two accused persons were further charged with contravening the Immigration Act as they were said to have entered and remained in the country without holding valid permits.

Ali and Iqbal were eventually admitted to bail with conditions attached. Amongst the conditions the accused persons must compensate the victim by assisting him to repair his damaged motor vehicle.

Tension

They were also ordered to make peace with the complainant and stop the tension between them.

This was to be done through the assistance of police officers who would also make sure that the complainant was not intimidated.

Following their release from custody, the accused persons have reportedly failed to meet some of the bail conditions.

This has also led to the complainant having to raise a concern to the effect that he is still having difficulty with making ends meet to support his family. Gul alleged that his damaged motor vehicle is still unusable, leaving him abandoned in his

The businessman who survived by running a grocery shop at Mpolonjeni said he is unable to go out and reload his stock as the vehicle he used remains damaged.

Gul has also alleged that he was now living in fear for his life, saying that his assailants are capable of launching another attack on him.

"I am saddened that my assailants made promises before the court when they were admitted to bail but they have not fulfilled them," said Gul. Meanwhile, the two other accused are said to remain in prison until the finalisation of their trial. This is because the state has convinced the court the accused persons are a flight risk.



Senator Mngomezulu tells

THE Swaziland government has removed all cultural impediments to the development and attainment of women's rights.

Addressing a meeting of the Southern Africa Development Community (SADC) Parliamentary Forum Regional Women's Parliamentary Caucus, Senator Bonsile Mngomezulu said all the social challenges that were associated with customary laws have since been done away with in Swaziland.

Challenge

The senator said child or forced marriages, which were still a challenge to some parts of Africa, was now history in Swaziland. Senator Mngomezulu said the Swaziland government has taken long strides in addressing child and women related issues, citing the Children Protection Act, 2012 as one piece of legislation that has been put in place with the view to improve the status and welfare of women in Swaziland.

Senator Mngomezulu told the Women Assembly that even those unfortunate school going children who happened to be

impregnated they retained their right to proceed with education.

Type

The type of education being . offered to the girls was itself non discriminatory, according to the senator. She said the challenge was now with girls themselves to ensure they steered clear of any illicit relationships that would ruin their future.

She said government's role of putting in place a legislative framework that would enable both girls and women to prosper in their various spheres had been done.

The senator said the same principle applied in the provision of health services. She said the country had no discriminatory laws and people had equal access to health services irrespective of their colour, gender or even sexual orientation.

"Every person has a right to be treated and no questions are asked," said the senator.

Senator Bonsile Mngomezulu attended the women caucus together with Senator Princess Phumelele from the Swaziland Parliament.

Connects over 1500 homestead with electricity

 Avails six bridges plus a dip tank for electorate

MOTSHANE – With less than 18 months remaining before the electorate go to the polls, residents under the Motshane Inkhundla have rallied behind their incumbent MP Phesheya Hlatshwayo for successfully implementing over 60 percent projects that were targeted for his term of office.

This is reflected in the constituency report that when the legislator assumed office in 2014, only five electricity projects out of 45 that had been targeted were managed to be covered by the previous incumbent.

However, when MP Hlatshwayo took office the residents tasked and assigned him to implement and complete the 37 electricity schemes that had been left unfinished. The schemes cut across at least six chiefdoms.

A recent survey has reflected that at least 35 electricity schemes have been attended to within three years and this has brought joy and a sigh of relief to the electorate under the Motshane constituency.

Over 1 500 homesteads that did not have electricity before the 10th Parliament have had their homesteads connected in a space of three years, under the incumbent legislator.

Most communities, according to the survey, that have benefited include Ekupheleni, Nduma, Sigangeni, Luhlendlweni, Siphocosini and Mantabeni Chiefdoms.

It transpired that at Ekupheleni about 375 homesteads benefited from the electricity scheme. About 68 homesteads got electricity connection at Nduma (Motshane) while 285 homesteads at Sigangeni now have access to electricity.


At least 192 were connected at Luhlendlweni while 370 were connected at Siphocosini. About 302 were connected at Mantabeni.



"Our MP has done well in attend-


MP COVERS 60% PROJECTS WITHIN 3 YEARS IN OFFICE









NO MORE DROWNING, CROCODILE ATTACKS





A man who is fathers to two young men who were nabbed for dagga trafficking in his car has appeared before the court with an application to have the vehicle temporarily returned to him while the trial continues.

The vehicle, a Toyota Lexus was taken in to police custody after Thembinkosi and Celumusa Magagula of Maphalaleni were found travelling in it and were in

possession of dagga weighing 9.29 kilograms.

The brothers were nabbed on May 24, at the Ngwenya border

The crown represented by Buddy Masangu asked the father of the two accused, Bernard Magagula, if he could tell the court how his sons possessed the vehicle on that fateful day.

He told the court that he had sent them out on an errand across the border in South Africa.

Crown Council Masangu then

the car had been taken from his children because they had been transporting dagga of which he replied that he was unaware of that.

The crown rested its case before it was argued as motivation for his application by Bernard that although his vehicle had been used to commit the crime of transporting dagga across the border he (Bernard) was not one of the accused.

He told the court that he had not sent the boys on an errand with drugs but had infact sent them on a

He claimed that he was unaware that the boys would end up engaging in criminal activity.

The crown did not object to the application to have the car returned to its owner, Bernard.

Condition

Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati granted the application on the condition that the vehicle in question would not be disposed of while the matter is on trial. The vehicle's appearance must not be altered in anyway and it must be availed before court whenever ordered.

Bernard Magagula agreed to abide by the conditions of the court and after producing papers to prove that he is the rightful owner of the vehicle it was returned to him.

I did not travel far from home - drunk - driver

A man has attempted to get a lighter sentence after being convicted for three traffic offences by informing the court that despite being caught driving drunk, he had not driven far from home and was not intending to go far either.

The accused, Bonginkosi Sithole of Mvutjini was busted driving his Opel Astra whilst under the influence of alcohol on May 29, near Somnjalose

He was also charged with two other traffic offences all from the same day.

Sithole was charged with reckless driving which resulted to him colliding with another car and further scratched it.

The third charge brought against him was that of failure to produce a valid driver's license when instructed to do so by officers of the law

The accused pleaded guilty to all three charges and was found guilty and convicted as per his plea.

A curious Mbabane Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati asked Sithole why he had been driving under the influence of alcohol.

The accused told the court that it was a mistake adding that he had not planned on travelling far from his home and had not travelled far from home when he was stopped and a breathalyzer test was conducted on him by police.

Magistrate Vilakati warned the accused that the distance travelled, under the influence of alcohol, was not a factor that is taken into consideration when one is caught driving under the influence.

"It is simply against the law to drive even the shortest distance while under the influence of alcohol," the magistrate said.

ordered to pay for the repairs to the vehicle that he had scratched whilst driving under the influence of alco-

The accused was also asked by the magistrate why he had not produced his driver's license, when asked to do so by the police, and he shocked the entire courtroom when he said he was not even the holder of a valid driver's license.

In mitigation, Sithole continued to tell the court that he believed he was travelling a distance so short that it should not require a driver's license.

He said he also felt that he should be given a lenient sentence because he did not travel far from home.

However, magistrate Vilakati was not impressed and informed the accused that he would not pass a lenient judgment.

"You drive drunk without a license and then you expect this DRUNK court to be lenient, I will not be lenient," he said.

He was fined E1 500 or spend 15 months in a correctional facility in respect of count one. He was fined E500 each for counts two and three, these two sentences would run consecutively.

In a nutshell, Sithole was fined E2 000 and in default of payment he would spend 20 months in a corrections facility.

I am unemployed - tearful accused tells court

A woman from Mbabane brokedown and cried in court as she was charged with contempt and one traffic offence.

Nonhlanhla Ginindza was charged with contempt after she failed to appear before court on May 30, to answer for the charge of reckless driving.

It is said the accused ran a red light near Total garage in Mbabane.

It appeared to be a straight forward case of a guilty plea followed by a conviction but when the accused was asked why she had not appeared before court on May 30, she told the court that she was unaware that she was expected to do so.

Ginindza said she was only aware of the E60 fine which appeared on the ticket which she had received from traffic officers on the day she committed the crime.

She said he is yet to pay the fine because she is currently unemployed and could not even raise E60 which was the fine.

However, Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati asked the accused woman when she planned to pay the fine and she broke down and cried, telling the court that she was struggling financially.

Ginindza said she could not guarantee a date by which she would have paid as she does not know when she will next be capable of paying E60.

When asked how she paid her bills, the accused told the court that she had just become unemployed.

Ginindza was found guilty on both charges and fined E500 for each of the two counts. However, the magistrate suspended both sentences for a year on condition that she does not commit a similar offence during that year.



This area is a few kilometres from Oshoek Border Gate. Many of the speakers who got an opportunity to address the scores of people who attended the event made it clear that they reported to His Majesty King Mswati III.

The chiefs in attendance even expressed their happiness as there was a representative of the King who came to grace the event.

The King's representative was Enkhanini Governor Lusendvo Fakudze and other speakers included Enikwakuyengwa Chief Roy Nkosi and Mpumalanga House of Traditional Leaders (MPHTL) Chairman Kgoshi Mokeona.

Fakudze expressed gratitude on behalf of the King for being a guest at the traditional ceremony. He stated during ummemo ceremony at Enikwakuyengwa Royal Kraal in Mpumalanga province in South Africa

that he, and his delegation from Swaziland, were sent by the King to grace the event on his behalf.

Grateful

"I am grateful of the attitude and spirit you have adopted as traditional leaders here at Mpumalanga province. Every time you stage an event of this nature, you know that you have to consult with the King before you go ahead. You still know where your roots are," Fakudze said.

Fakudze affirmed to the authorities at Enikwakuyengwa, and the population of that area that they were indeed Swazis.

He said they were descendents of King Somhlolo (King Sobhuza I), through his son Fokoti. He urged the traditional leaders to stick to their culture and traditions because they defined them as Swazis.

MPHTL Chair reads Riot Act to youth

MPUMALANGA House of Traditional Leaders (MPHTL) Chairperson Kgoshi Mokoena has strongly condemned unruly youth that brings nothing but chaos to the province.

Mokeona said this on Saturday during the ummemo ceremony at Enikwakuyengwa Royal Kraal.

The chairman said he was taken aback each time a young boy would decide to challenge a traditional leader's legitimacy.

"We have chiefs here who have ruled for about 30 years, but it is disturbing to find a young boy who is approaching 20 years of age challenging the legitimacy of that leader. When you sit down with that particular person to find out why he says such a thing, you find that there is no valid reason for him to say that," Mokoena said.

He said such actions even brought disrepute to the whole institution of traditional leaders in the province.

He said such would make traditional leaders not to be regarded with the respect they deserved. Mokoena said as an institution that was responsible for preserving traditional institutions, they would not allow such actions to continue. This was more so because in some instances, it would be found that the youth would not know even the history of their own family.

"At times, we would ask the youth to tell us about the history of his own family, only to find that they do not know it," he said. He said there was no way one could challenge traditional authorities without knowing the history of traditional leaders.

He said it was almost impossible for one to know such history without knowing one's family history. Chiefs, according to Mokoena, were not coming from nowhere, but they were installed by God, through the King.





Mandela's step-daughter steers forum on women empowerment

NELSON Mandela's stepdaughter Josina Machel led a day long empowerment forum addressing solutions to violence against women and girls at Sibane Hotel last Thursday.

Machel, an abuse survivor herself strongly believes there is no justification to violence.

This she said as she told a story of how she was beaten and lost her right eye sight during the incident.

Machel and her boyfriend argued after she had to spend the night at her family home in Maputo.

"After insulting me, he punched me repeatedly in the face, resulting to my right eye being blinded instantly.

I knew after the third punch that I had to run away, I got out of the car and started running until I got to a quiet neighborhood. I screamed out for help but the only sound that resonated with mine were dogs barking," she said.

She lamented as the room was dead silent following her presenta-

JOSINA Machel, on Friday, visited St Michaels High school to address and interact the pupils.

Machel who is a physical abuse survivor aimed to teach all ladies who suffered abuse in the hands of people they trust, to stand up.

After that incident Machel said she took it upon herself to fight violence against women in Africa. Coming from a political background, she has been an agent of

ground, she has been an agent of change, as Machel joined her parents in the fight for independence in Mozambique.

Machel is a founder of Kuhluka Movement, an initiative set up to empower women survivors of abuse and to provide safe shelter; as well as comprehensive services to help restore and rehabilitate them.

The Kuhluka movement partnered with the Kirsh Foundation and Seeds of Hope Outreach (SOHO) to put the Sibane forum together and to ensure it made the profound impact it was supposed Machel spent two years of her education in Swaziland at the Waterford Kamhlaba College.

Feels

She strongly feels she is part of Swaziland, because the two countries Mozambique and Swaziland fought the same struggle to free-

to.

Machel enlightened many when she explained why she named her Movement, 'Kuhluka'. 'Kuhluka in my mother's language means rebirth. Taken from a certain tree back in Mozambique, no matter how many times it is cut and its roots pulled out, it always grows back bright and healthy.

"Women are the vessel of life. A woman can be heavily pregnant but she suffers abuse day in and day out, but is still able to give birth to a beautiful healthy baby," she added

Machel believed her duty was to fight against violence and at the end of the day see to it that it ends

Machel wanted to see a world where women were free from any form of violence.

MTN Bushfire festival bushy



BEFORE I tackle today's subject which is the now internationally recognised annual MTN Bushfire Festival, I feel duty bound to say one or two things about the death of magician Mduduzi Gama.

I will ignore the defensive mode our police service has engaged in through their PRO Khulani Mamba.

Again, I will not apportion blame but rather allow history to do the talking.

Gama, according to a vendor, was allegedly left for dead by two police officers, whether in the middle or side of the road, it makes no difference.

He was left for dead.

According to the vendor, Gama looked weary. He had a gaping wound to the forehead. He was 'off-loaded' from a police van by two uniformed police officers.

In all honesty, the vendor had nothing to lose. The vendor had nothing to gain either by implicating the police. She never knew Gama was to later die.

She is just a vendor who is interested in the number of bananas she sells a day. She has no agenda or politics. If anything, police help her with nothing.

Belongings

On the said day, the vendor saw a police van, two police officers and a dying man being taken out of it with his belongings. Police need to get the said officers and the van if that would help.

What the vendor saw is archetypal of our police force anyway- they can be that careless and reckless. Brutal if you like. They lie if given an opportunity. I always remember Mathousand, the man who died for a stove.

Another case in point is that of Mozambican Luciano Zavale who died with the integrity of our police force. He was left for dead at the RFM hospital ironically by two police officers who were to later lie that he was found somewhere around Manzini when infact he had been tortured by them.

I will leave Ayanda Mkhabela's misfortune. She is a living testimony of what police's carelessness can do. Her children will always refer to her as a police 'cabbage'.

The denials by PRO Mamba in the Gama saga are akin to those that were made by his colleagues from Manzini in the Zavale case. A litany of untruths was told.

One being that Zavale fell from a bench and died. Listen to that rubbish.

A doctor's report suggested he was tortured until his lungs collapsed. Never mind that a year later there is still no report from the inquest that followed thereafter.

Once again in the Gama saga, like it happened in Zavale's, our money is about to be spent gratuitously as another probe into a

death that could have been avoided will be set up. We waste.

A coroner who will leave her/his job will be appointed to waste our money. I think it is time something happens within the police force to set the tone. For now, I don't know what.

As things stand, in the absence of an independent body to help in such instances, police are investigating themselves once again.

Something is not right. I hear the family wants revenge; I call for calm and patience.

This then brings me to the Bushfire Festival concoction. See, 10 years ago when the festival started it was none of my business. It looked like a private affair of one Jiggs and his family.

Underprivileged

However, it became fully part of my business when the organisers started marketing it as a gimmick to raise funds for the underprivileged. I liked the thinking of mixing pleasure with serious national issues.

It again became my business when companies both private and public started pouring resources, that could have otherwise been directly channeled to the poor, into it.

Really, I see no point why a company would opt to channel money into charity via a long, noisy and groovy route. What happened to direct injection?

The bushfire festival again becomes every Swazi's business when a heavy battalion of police officers are dispatched to provide security at the event.

It also becomes our business when cabinet ministers spend hours hanging out there. They don't go there on their spare time; it's on our shift as taxpayers because we pay them.

Given the above, no one would argue

against the festival being a national concern (yindzaba yetfu sonkhe). I forgot to mention that schools around Lobamba and Malkerns have lessons adjusted to accommodate 'learning' at Bushfire.

They become part of the gig.

What is my point? My point is simple; it is time the organizers make public the financial statements of the festival, strictly the festival because it's now a public/charitable affair.

It is time they tell us how much they make from the three-day event, we must know.

I was happy that MTN CEO Ambrose Dlamini revealed that his company pumped in E1.2 million into the festival. Now, this should form the base of what I am requesting from the organizers of the successful event.

Declare

All the companies that contribute to the 'good bushfire festival cause' must declare how much they donate because some of them are very public.

Again, they must explain why they opted to go via the festival to help the needy. I would have liked to see them go direct to the recipients to avoid the costly way of getting AKA from South Africa to perform at a fee.

Say for instance if the organizers can give us the list of companies including the monetary value of what they donated.

In the meantime, National Commissioner of Police Isaac Magagula calculates the overtime we pay the police officers who are placed on duty at the festival.

Magagula must then post the amount accrued as a donation to the festival from government.

The same goes for the organizers of the festival who must now declare how much is made from the gate takings. This, I say given the fact that over 25 000 people are said to have attended this year's bushfire festival.

My rough calculations tell me that if you multiply the number of people who came through, with the average ticket price of E359, you get something close to E2 million. I am certain it's way more than that because this excludes the price for a VIP ticket.

Add the MTN's E1.2 million to that, you hit E3 million. Again, this excludes the money paid by stall vendors to sell at the festival. I hear the prices are steep and that lead to the food they sell being expensive.

Have you ever heard of a slice of pizza sold for E25?. Taximen servicing the party animals at the festival are also made to pay to be there.

I hear each taximan was made to pay E500 to be eligible to service the party animals that attended the festival. Also, it is normal that beer flows in such events and hundreds of thousands are made from its sale.

So, the balance sheet I am requesting will in turn assist us Swazis who are supporters of charity to evaluate if what the festival organizers give back to charity is satisfactory.

Beggars can't be choosers, I agree. But still being a beggar does not take away certain rights. As beggars we need to know the particulars because our name, is used to popularize the event. We have a right to demand answers from the public companies that take money via an umdangalazo to us. We like it clean and untouched.

Beggars

We have in the past experienced annoying instances where the name of charity or us beggars had been abused by promoters who used it to maximize their profits.

If the bushfire festival organizers have difficulty in going public with their books they must remove the word charity that earns them sympathy and support from the gullible public.

Personally, I am not happy with what normally goes to charity from such events in general, not because of its size alone but because of the secrecy.

Government must help us get around this. There must be a representative from government to ensure our interests as beggars are protected.

I am sure MTN would agree with me on this because the E1.2 million would have gone a long way if it was channeled into the more practical 21 days of y'ello care that was launched last week. There is a lot of transparency there.

Like I stated earlier, the bushfire concept started as a private affair until it attracted public scrutiny because of its charitable tag, which I am certain was genuine.

I am not sure if I am asking for too much. I am hoping for more positive changes in the next edition.

I also implore MTN to evaluate if the E1.2 million cannot be directly donated to charity than going via the bushy route.

Yes MTN is private but given the nature of the business it is in, the public holds the key now that the monopoly is dead.

Last week, my son and I decided to scale the face of Sibebe.

As I looked down from the middle of that huge rock, clinging on by my toes and fingertips, I felt that warm, sick feeling in the pit of my stomach we are all familiar with: FEAR. Indeed, it's the first time I can remember experiencing this level of anxiety. "BE the lizard" I told myself, desperately trying to keep a low centre of gravity. As I reached across for the next finger hold my left arm shook under the strain, protesting: "you are no lizard!"

Induced

Fear is a feeling induced by perceived danger that typically causes a change in our bodies (rapid pulse, shallow breathing, sweaty palms, etc.) and in our behaviour (fleeing, hiding, freezing).

These responses are based on how our minds assess the danger; our fears are therefore either rational or irrational. An irrational fear is called a phobia. Anxiety is distinguished from fear in that it is caused by threats we believe are unavoidable. What are you afraid of? Check

the following list of common causes: demons / ghosts, cockroaches, spiders, snakes, heights, water, enclosed spaces, tunnels, bridges, needles, social rejection, failure, examinations, public speaking. (I see I'm not the only scaredy-cat when it comes to injections!) For Americans, apparently, the top ten include terrorist attacks, spiders, death, being a failure, war, criminal/gang violence, being alone, the future, and nuclear war. What is our top ten in Swaziland?

Harmless

Remember the old nursery rhyme, "Little Miss Muffet..."? Poor spiders really do get a bad rap! Most of their 45 000 species are harmless, yet someone with arachnophobia (between 3 to 6 percent of the population) often feel uneasy in a place where webs are visible or that may harbour spiders. Objects that look like spiders or even realistic drawings of them can trigger

panic attacks. Whether this phobia is the result of genetics or culture is still not known.

We may laugh at the unfortunate minority who experience such irrational fears, but we have our own! Take xenophobia, our fear of strangers or foreigners. Why are we so afraid of them? Are we not 'deceived by what is perceived'? We believe they are here to steal our jobs, abuse our benefits, fleece our gullible.

Panicked

This is the fear of contemporary Europeans, panicked at the thought of hordes of Syrian refugees flooding across their borders.

Consider the plight of the refugee, my friends. Abraham, Sarah and our Lord Jesus found sanctuary in Egypt. Jacob fled to Harran, Moses to Midian, Naomi to Moab, Ruth to Judah, David to the land of his enemy the Philistines. The Bible is full of the stories of characters and

peoples who were forcibly displaced. Indeed, since the time of Adam and Eve we have all been alienated from God's presence and it took a heavenly missionary, Christ, to bring us Home again.

Today, there is no country on earth untouched by the challenges of forced migration. In many cases, people from previously 'unreached' nations are camping on our doorsteps!

Afraid

Instead of being afraid of them, let us embrace this God-given opportunity and see them as fellow humans instead of dangerous threats. Invite them in for a cup of tea, offer their children a lift to school, visit them when they're sick. In short, be a neighbour!

And who is my neighbour? Dear Lord, let me answer that question in your name. Amen


Former President Bill Clinton, Bryant Gumbel and Billy Crystal will be giving eulogies, as the champion had previously request-

Oscar Pistorius case: The unresolved issues

DOLUS eventualis: quo vadis?

As we draw closer to the sentencing hearing in the Pistorius matter, which has been scheduled to start on June 13 2016, it is appropriate to reflect - in terms of finally concluding on the matter on some of the key legal issues related to the case. Whereas most members of the public have probably at this stage 'had more than enough' of the case, there are some of those issues that remain unresolved, and it is important to resolve them.

Since the Constitutional Court (CC) did not grant leave to appeal for it to hear the matter, it is indeed 'the end of the road' for Oscar Pistorius himself in terms of not being officially labelled a murderer, and he will almost certainly now receive a heavier sentence. As far as the Law is concerned, however, the resolution of the issue of the correct application of dolus eventualis in cases of potential putative justification is not relevant only to the Pistorius case.

Since the CC will not address the matter of dolus eventualis in cases of potential putative justification in the Pistorius case, it is up to independent jurists who write on Criminal Law not to allow the issue to be left behind in the 'dust cloud' that this case has created. The purpose of the present twopart article is to ensure that any person who reads it will understand the basic contents of dolus (criminal intent) in Zuadi African Law. From a substantive Criminal Law point of view, two major issues still remain to be resolved. Although neither the Supreme Court of Appeal (SCA) nor the CC is likely to have the opportunity to address those issues soon, the lower Courts can still be guided by formal juristic writing in the event of a matter of putative justification arising. Indeed, the Courts often refer (sometimes extensively) to

juristic writing in substantiating their application of the Law. A recent example is particularly relevant for present purposes:

In the relatively recent case of S v Brown 2015 (1) SACR 211 (SCA), the SCA approvingly quoted Professor CR Snyman (who has been quoted countless times by the Courts in recent three decades) at [104]:

"It is necessary, whilst engaging, in the exercise referred to in the preceding paragraph, namely an evaluation of the evidence consistent with Brown's plea, to remind ourselves of the definition of dolus eventualis. In CR Snyman Criminal Law 5ed (2008) at 184 it is defined as follows:

'A person acts with intention in the form of dolus eventualis if the commission of the unlawful act or the causing of the unlawful result is not his main aim, but: (a) he subjectively foresees the possibility that, in striving towards his

GOVT OFFERS ANOTHER BOND WORTH E150 MILLION

GOVERNMENT has again announced its intention to raise E150 million through the public offering of a bond within the Swazi financial markets.

This auction comes just after government raised E200 million from the sale of the SG024 bond, which was auctioned on May 2016.

In January the government raised E76 million through auction of the SG023 reopening bond.

If the SG025 bond is fully allotted through the auction, the government would be able to raise E426 million in the debt markets over six months.

The SG025 bond, that the government intends to auction, has a maturity of five years and has a fixed coupon rate of 10 percent

"On behalf of the Government of the Kingdom of Swaziland, the Central Bank of Swaziland is announcing the launch of a five year government bond. The coupon rate for this bond will be

fixed at10 percent. The auction date shall be June 15, 2016 for the sum E 150 million," said the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) in a statement.

Issuance

"The purpose of the issuance is to: develop the secondary market; establish a fair market price; which will compensate both the borrower and investors for interest rate risks; and to facilitate financial intermediation, whilst also meeting Government budgetary requirements," said the bank.

Bond

Interestingly the CBS recently announced that government would be redeeming the SG013

bond which had the face value of E150 million, the exact amount the government will be seeking from the SG025 bond.

The bank called all investors, who were holding the bond, to visit or call the bank to update the register and ensure that their names were included in the register.

"The last day to register is June 9, 2016 and those whose names appear on the register on that day will be eligible for redemption payment which will be made on 20 June 2016," said the bank.

According to the SG013 bond Pricing Supplement dated May 23, 2011, the government will have to pay the principal, which is E150 million, plus the final semi-annual coupon on the day of redemption, which is on June 20, 2016. Thus it would appear that government would only have to pay the interest payments to investors as the proceeds from the impending auction, on June 15, 2016, would result in government receiving another E150 million.

INSURANCE PENETRATION RATE SITS AT ONLY 2%

GOVT NEEDS TO PRIORITISE THE INFORMAL SECTOR

DUE to constant rise of unemployment levels in Swaziland across all sectors, the economy is slowly shaping towards the formation of the informal sector.

This assertion was made by Southern African Research Foundation for Economic Development (SARFED) Regional Coordinator George Choongwa.

However, he said government and other stakeholders seem reluctant in addressing the demands of this sector and nurture it to become even much sustainable, hence bridging the widening poverty gap in the country.

"The economy is characterised with wide and stagnant economic growth which is however likely to be under pressure as globalisation proceeds, transition and developing countries like Swaziland and its enterprises face major challenges for strengthening their human and institutional capacities to take advantage of trade and investment opportunities both on a regional and global context," said Choongwa.

He said while government make policies in trade and investment areas, it was the enterprises either formal or

informal that trade and invest, therefore the supply-side bottlenecks in the trade and investment areas and how government and its development partners and the private sector itself addressed these constraints have direct implications on the economic growth potential of the country.

Handle

"In as much as it may seem a complex matter to handle, it must be clear to state that to deal with this informality and to transform this sector successfully calls for explicit recognition of this complexity in the first place," he said. Choongwa said government could consider looking at strategies that would transform this sector into a viable and resilient sector, "this would gain much capacity to grow, create productive employment and increase their productivity and competitiveness, and ultimately generate higher incomes for those operating in the sector." This would reduce the sky rocketing levels of unemployment to drastic levels.

"However, government must understand that such a transformation requires a range of interventions aimed at reducing the cost of doing business in the informal sector environment and to selective interventions tailored and targeted to address the specific constraints facing the informal enterprises in their diversity," said Choongwa.

Desire

However, he said this trend has not yet been practiced on the economic front of Swaziland and as a result the emerging small businesses were discouraged to grow their respective businesses as desired, and yet this sector was considered to be the best job creation strategy because it created jobs typically through apprenticeship.

jobs typically through apprenticeship. Once the apprentice acquires necessary skills, they move out and set up

He said large and self sustained economies like China and India started by nurturing small businesses which eventually became some of the world leading firms that have strengthened the private sector, hence stimulating economic growth and development.

The global perspective is premised on the evolving nature of the informal econ-

omy, in terms of its scope and activities over time.

Choongwa said the recent upheavals in the global economy, the resilience of the informal economy and the expanding informality in Africa have triggered a rethinking of the position of the informal economy in development policy.

"There is need, therefore, for better understanding of the informal economy and its changing role in contemporary development process and policy towards poverty and employment and inclusive development if Swaziland was to move forward as a developing state," he said.

"However, despite this great opportunity of growing the economy at Gross Domestic Product (GDP) per capita, jobs in this sector are still associated with low productivity, low incomes and vulnerability and yet some informal economic activities result from the response of formal firms to reduce labour costs and increase competitiveness through subcontracting chains or

by avoiding costs associated with organized labour and state regulation of the economy (such as taxes and social legislation)," said the coordinator.

He said, therefore, other informal sector enterprises may chose to remain informal in response to a hostile legal system and regulatory framework or may choose to operate informally after weighing the costs-benefits of informality relative to formality.

We continue to rely on our innovative and passionate tourism industry to support our efforts to make Indaba and Meetings Africa successful, world class events" reads the statement.

The statement further revealed that Meetings Africa would also continue to be hosted by the city of Johannesburg and Gauteng Province from February 28 to March 1, 2017. Local tourism

industry players usually attend both trade shows exhibitions with the view of showcasing local tourism facilities and related businesses.

Swaziland Tourism Authority's (STA) Marketing Manager Bongani Dlamini said as the local industry they were happy about the developments because initially the trade shows were strategized this way for a reason.

SWAZILAND HAS SLOWEST GROWING ECONOMY

THE country is projected to have the slowest growing economy on the continent with its gross domestic product (GDP) at only 1.7 percent according to the African Development Bank (AfDB).

Economic growth expectations for Swaziland would remain low in 2016, at just below two percent per annum. The African Development Bank (AfDB) African Economic Outlook Report 2016 stated that Swaziland's economic growth slowed down in 2015 to 1.7 percent, mainly because of severe drought, with prospects in 2016 and 2017 remaining poor.

"Swaziland's growth prospects are predicated on improved weather conditions and enhanced policy efforts to address critical challenges in areas such as the business climate and export diversification," said the report. This view was also shared by the World Bank Outlook report 2016. "Swaziland's economic outlook is expected to continue on a downward path particularly in the short term. Real GDP growth is projected at 1.3 percent in 2016 down from 1.7 percent in 2015," said the report. "As a result of these weak economic prospects, poverty and inequality are expected to remain critical challenges as growth of disposable income and job creation slows down," reads

the report as part. A dip in foreign investment has been identified as one reason why Swaziland has recorded low growth prospects. "Foreign investment into Africa increased by 16 percent from to E862 billion in 2015, according to International Monetary Fund (IMF) figures," the AfDB reported. Mozambique, Swaziland's neighbour, received over E70 billion thus it was one of the leading African investment destinations in 2015.

Trade

However, given the limited trade with Mozambique there was little economic spill over into Swaziland. The investment within Africa has been led by South Africa, Nigeria and Kenya, mainly in banking, retail and telecommunications. Morocco, through banking and insurance companies such as Attijariwafa and Saham Insurance, has become a major investor but mainly in Frenchspeaking countries. South Africa is the top investor in the southern African region, about 80 percent of foreign investment into Botswana, Lesotho, Namibia and Swaziland comes from South Africa. The bank said "Another problem compounding the issue of slow growth is that Swaziland saw considerably less aid." "This is a regional problem as Southern African countries, notably Lesotho, Angola and South Africa, all have recorded low aid rates," the bank reported.

Currently, the interest rate is at seven percent. He urged people to budget properly and to avoid over committing themselves on loans which could result to them failing to service their loans. With a projected increase of petrol prices, Lukhele said that might escalate inflationary pressures which could add a burden to the already strained consumers.

Drought

"Since we are experiencing the ongoing drought the cost of food is increasing, but we are hopeful that maybe inflationary pressures will somewhat ease and interest rates would then decline and the affordability for most goods will return to normal," said Lukhele.

Access to credit grew my business - SME

ACCESS to credit has a potential to increase the size of Small Medium Enterprises (SME's) in Swaziland.

Mavis Zwane a seamstress from Siphofaneni said that due to the availably of credit from Inhlanyelo Fund she was able to grow her business within a short period of time. "In a short space of time we have had to expand the area in which we work and display our wares as the business is growing," she said. She said when she started her business it was just her. "But now I have employed a number of people and I am able to pay their wages," she said.

The entrepreneur's shop has a number of sewing machines and an embroidery machine all of which represent assets for her shop. "Access to credit has also allowed me to purchase assets for my shop which are critical to the expansion of my business," she said. The seamstress explained she specialised in the making of school uniforms around her area although she did do some jobs for other private companies.

"The school uniforms side of the business is seasonal, but continues to grow strong as there are more uniforms I produce than before, for different schools," she said. She said the availability of credit was also very important as it allowed her to fund her working capital requirements especially during the busy season. Zwane explained that during January to April the demand for uniforms shoots up

significantly and therefore, they needed a lot of raw material to be able to meet the demands of their customers hence they need capital to buy the raw materials. Zwane said when she started, the major financial services in the country were not interested in providing her with credit but now they are very interested in extending credit to her.

Repayments

Meanwhile, Inhlanyelo Fund Executive Manager Wandile Kunene said because of the constant repayments that clients like Zwane were making they are able to create a credit history for her as evidence to financial institutions that she has the ability and character to pay off debt. "This is one of the advantages of obtaining a loan from the fund," he added. Inhlanyelo Fund provides finance to over 10 000 grassroots entrepreneurs across the country through their constituencies.

The Inhlanyelo Fund is partly funded by Kirsh Family Foundation and Swaziland Kirsh Industries (SWAKI). Speaking during the Swaziland

Fair Trade (SWIFT) International fair trade day celebrations held last month Swaziland Development Finance Corporation (FINCORP) Group Managing Director Dumisani Msibi said SMEs have limited options for access to credit and there was a need to expand debt finance options for the sector through options like joint venture capital, private equity investments, quasi equity placements, and initial public offerings to broaden the chances of access to capital.

NAIROBI - Two secondary school students and a passer-by were hurt by gunfire Friday as hundreds of youngsters turned out to protest the arrest of pupils accused of defacing the president's photo, witnesses said. The trouble broke out after the arrest of eight 9th-year students aged between 15 and 17 for vandalising a picture of President Pierre Nkurunziza in their human sciences textbook, a teacher told AFP.

Trial opens for journo union leaders

CAIRO - The trial of three top members of Egypt's journalists' union accused of allegedly harbouring two fugitive colleagues opened on Saturday with one defendant calling it an attack on public freedoms. Egyptian Journalists Syndicate president Yahiya Kallash, secretary general Gamal Abd el-Rahim and freedoms committee chief Khaled Elbalshy have been charged with aiding fugitives after two reporters sought by police staged a sit-in at the union's offices.

DAKAR - West Africa should 'think harder' about developing a new anti-terror force, a top regional official said Saturday, as Niger announced the latest deaths among its troops battling Boko Haram jihadists.

Over the past year West Africa has suffered terror attacks on nations previously untouched by jihadists, as well as confronting an Islamist insurgency that began in northeast Nigeria but has spread to several neighbouring countries.

That meant greater intelligence sharing and military co-operation is required, said the incoming head of the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) commission, which implements policy decisions agreed by its 15 members.

"The multiplication of terrorist hotbeds in our region compels us to share information on their activities, to communicate, coordinate and harmonise our efforts," said Benin's Marcel Alain de Souza at an ECOWAS summit in Dakar.



TO MY GARDENER...

I LEAVE MY GARDEN

 Amazing tale of the grateful owner who gifted Britain's finest Japanese-style haven to her green-fingered good samaritan (and she even threw in a £1.6m house, too)

LONDON - From its simple exterior, it would be impossible to guess that behind the red brick walls of a rural cottage in the heart of Kent lies the finest example of a Japanese garden in Britain.

Even more astonishing is that the gardener who spent more than two decades working unpaid to help create the glorious landscape was given the property by its grateful owner. And last week, that devoted gardener's family had advertised it for sale for £1.6 million.

The story of this extraordinary labour of love began in the 1960s when Jean Handcock and her husband Michael took a day trip to look for a countryside hideaway to buy. But they lost their way in the quiet lanes of Kent and found themselves in the tiny village of Seal, near Sevenoaks.

There they knocked on the door of Lantern Cottage to ask for directions, and it was opened by Audrey Ede.

This chance encounter led to a 20-year friendship during which Mrs Handcock would lovingly care for Mrs Ede's sprawling Japanese garden and eventually inherit it in Mrs Ede's will.

Mrs Handcock is no longer alive but her husband has never forgotten the day that changed their lives.

"We knocked on the door and this lady answered who had obviously just put her lunch on," said Mr Handcock, now 82.

"She thought we'd come to see the Japanese garden. We told her we were looking for another cottage and she said, 'Well, if you're interested in cottages, you can come back and see mine at 3pm." So we did, and that was the beginning of quite a relationship.' On taking up Mrs Ede's invitation, Mr and Mrs Handcock were escorted around what eminent garden historian Professor

Christopher Thacker once lauded as 'the most convincingly authentic of the Japanese gardens created in the British Isles'.

Estate

The Grade II listed garden had originally been part of a 25-acre estate owned by wealthy fruit farmer Hugh Micklem. He com-

missioned the garden in 1919, and travelled to Japan to source trees, plants, rocks, a tea-house and garden ornaments, including granite lanterns.

Mrs Handcock (pictured) would regularly travel from her home in London to help restore the site to its former glory

But Mr Handcock said that during their tour of Mrs Ede's oriental garden, they noticed that, although it was still exquisite, it had started to fall into decay.

Mrs Ede's husband – a former Army colonel – had died and the couple did not have children, so she needed help looking after the acre of land with its idyllic water features, ornate rockeries and exotic flowers.

Assist

Mrs Handcock, a keen gardener, was so taken with the garden's beauty that she offered to assist with its upkeep – and would regularly travel from her home in London to help restore the site to its former glory. 'She would go once a week or twice a week,' Mr Handcock revealed.

"She cut down boughs, opened up vistas and organised volunteers. She spent her whole life there.

"The garden wouldn't be there if my wife hadn't made the sacrifice of looking after it." Mrs Handcock was never paid for looking after the site, but when Mrs Ede died in the 1980s, she discovered just how valued her work had been.

"I got a call one day from someone who said they wanted to get in touch with my wife," Mr Handcock said. "They were solicitors calling her to say that she had inherited the house and the garden." Asked why his wife had been given such a generous gift, Mr Handcock replied: "It was her kindness and all her help."

He said she was 'delighted' with the news that she now owned her labour of love, but quickly realised it would be quite a responsibility.

"Japanese gardens are not designed for ease of maintenance," he said.

But Mrs Handcock continued to tirelessly tend the garden until her own death in 2007.

The garden was occasionally opened for residents of Seal to marvel at the artistry of its land-scape.

In 2011 Mr Handcock passed the ownership of Lantern Cottage and its amazing garden on to his daughter and it was recently put on the market for £1.6 million.

"I just hope the person who buys the house looks after the garden and appreciates it as we did," he said. *Dailymail*.

Mohamed A Nur, who is the CEO of City Garden Group of Companies, told The Citizen on Sunday that he would present his name to the country's parliament, which would elect the head of state. "In Somalia there is no functioning political party system. The names of independent presidential candidates are presented to the lower and upper parliaments which elects the president," he said. The 45year-old Nur came with his family to Tanzania in the mid-1980s, shortly before the Horn of Africa country plunged into lawlessness followed by two decades of civil war and without any effective administration until 2012 when a formal central government was established.

"Sunil Gomes was hacked to death at his grocery store just near a church at Bonpara village," Shafiqul Islam, deputy police chief of Natore district where the murder took place, told AFP. Another police officer, inspector Abdur Razzak, said the motive for the killing of 65-yearold Gomes was unclear. But the attack was similar to those on Hindus, Buddhists and members of other religious minorities in Muslim-majority Bangladesh in recent months.

"We will never accept the accusation of genocide," Erdogan said, according to the state-run Anadolu news agency, referring to a German resolution on the massacres of ethnic Armenians and other Christian minorities during World War I by the Ottoman Empire.

He also said Ankara must be treated fairly when it comes to solving shared problems, otherwise Turkey will cease to be a "barrier" for Europe and let the EU handle its issues on its own.

CLINTON ATTACKS ON TRUMP FIRE UP SUPPORTERS

CALIFORNIA - Hillary Clinton's savage takedown of Donald Trump in her recent foreign policy speech has her supporters fired up.

As the likely Democratic nominee toured California on Saturday, crowds burst into applause at the mere mention of Thursday's speech, in which Clinton cast Trump as dangerously unqualified to be president. Supporters say they feel more confident and excited in the wake of the address — which could benefit Clinton, who has struggled to inspire enthusiasm throughout the drawn-out primary contest. "I loved it. I was waiting for that," said Leslie Milke, 56, of Woodland Hills, a professor at Los Angeles Mission College, who saw Clinton. "I knew she was capable of that kind of speech....It really made me feel energised. It made me feel like we can win."

Clinton's speech in San Diego previewed her intention to mount an aggressive campaign against the real estate mogul. In it, she said Trump would lead the nation toward war and economic crisis, contrasting it with her long years of diplomatic experience and public service. Looking to the November general election, Clinton, who is expected to clinch the Democratic nomination in the coming days, said that electing Trump would be a "historic mistake". News24

CUBAN PRESIDENT RAUL CASTRO SLAMS OAS

HAVANA -Cuban President Raul Castro on Saturday slammed the secretary general of the Organization of American States (OAS), Luis Almagro, for his recent statements on Venezuela and said the island "would never" return to that organization.

"The OAS since its foundation was, is and will be an instrument of imperialist domination and no reform will change its nature and history. That is why Cub 1 will never return to the OAS," vowed Castro at the opening of the VII Summit of the Association of Caribbean States (ACS) in

Havana.

Castro criticized the position taken last week by Almagro on Venezuela, which saw him call for the organization to invoke its Inter-American Democratic Charter, leading to the potential suspension of Venezuela from the bloc for alleged "human rights violations and lack of democra-

Concern

"It is of deep concern that there is an unacceptable attempt to apply the Inter-American Democratic Charter of the OAS to intervene in the internal affairs of Venezuela," said the Cuban

He also reiterated Havana's support for President Nicolas Maduro's administration and said Caracas faces an "imperialist offensive" to topple its socialist government.

"We firmly oppose the destabilization agenda and economic war faced by Maduro's government and support the revolution that has brought social changes to the Venezuelan people," he added.

ACS foreign ministers discussed several issues of importance on Friday, including the political situation in Venezuela, which led to a common declaration of support





Yo ho ho and a plate of grubs

WHILE you can bet a treasure chest of gold, diamonds and pearls that the food served on the set of the pirate drama series
Black Sails (the fourth season is currently filming in Cape Town) is nothing but the best.

The menu aboard ships in the Golden Age of Piracy in the early 1700s was anything but nutritious, appealing or even edible! Pirates lived in cramped, miserable conditions and suffered from debilitating diseases, with the majority of them dying before the age of 30 as a result of warfare, the gallows or, indeed, a very poor diet. Shipboard food was limited to what would keep in the course of prolonged voyages Bread came in the form of hardtack or "ship's biscuit", rock hard squares of flourand-water dough that after a few weeks at sea was inevitably infested with weevils. Beef was salted or dried and so tough that sailors often carved it into buttons and belt buckles. Beer, ale and rum were the choice of drink since all kept better than fresh water.

Occasionally, pirate fare was far worse. Pirate Henry Morgan and his crew, stranded in 1670, were forced to eat leather satchels while female pirate Charlotte de Berry's crew, shipwrecked and in desperate straits, turned to cannibalism, eating two slaves as well as De Berry's husband.

On the other side of the doubloon though, there was William Dampier, once described as "a pirate of exquisite mind". As well as a buccaneer, Dampier was also a naturalist, author, world traveller and adventurous foodie. Over a thousand entries in the Oxford English Dictionary are attributed to Dampier, many of them having to do with food. Dampier gave us such terms as barbecue, cashew, kumquat, soy sauce and tortilla. Dampier was certainly an adventurous eater, sampling flamingos ("the flesh is lean and black yet very good meat"), armadillos ("tastes much like land-turtle"), locusts ("very moist, their heads would crackle in one's teeth"), sea lions and Galapagos tortoises - the flesh of which he compared to chicken. He also recorded what may be the first recipe for mango chutney, noting: "When the mango is young, they cut them in two pieces, and pickled them with salt and vinegar, in which they put some cloves of garlic. This is an excellent sauce, and much esteemed."

Other than hardtack and salt beef, the closest we may get to a genuine pirate dish today is salmagundi, a concoction of meat, fish, vegetables, and fruits and which some refer to as a precusor to day's "Chef's Salad". For those adventurous enough, try this recipe from 1712: "Chop into small chunks turtle meat, chicken, pork, beef, ham, pigeon and fish. Marinate with spiced wine and roast. Add the meats to boiled chopped cabbage, anchovies, pickled herring, mango, hard-boiled eggs, palmnearts, onions, olives and grapes. Add pickled chopped vegetables and garlic, chilli pepper, mustard, salt and pepper, and serve in a mound upon a large dish."

LIVING the celebrity life must be a struggle seeing as some stars have chosen to go under the knife or drop a few pounds all in the name of fame.

FOREMAN PAYS TRIBUTE TO HIS FOE, FRIEND ALI


UNITED STATES - George Foreman no longer wonders why a devastating defeat at the hands of Muhammad Ali in the fabled Rumble in the Jungle of 1974 proved the catalyst for an enduring friendship.

"Everybody falls in love with him, you can't help it," Foreman told CNN a day after the three-time heavyweight world champion Ali died in Arizona after battling Parkinson's disease for decades.

Foreman and Ali are forever linked by that clash in Kinshasa, where Ali knocked out the previously unbeaten Foreman in the eighth round to regain the crown he hadn't held since being banned from boxing in 1967 for refusing to fight in the Vietnam War.

Amid the tributes pouring in for Ali's principled stand, Foreman noted that 40 years ago, Ali's stance had made him a pariah.

"Everybody turned on him," Foreman said. "I was doing an interview in Miami, Florida. He came into



the gym and they turned the cameras off."

The Supreme Court's reversal of Ali's draft evasion conviction gave him a second chance "and he was the greatest show in the world," Foreman said. And Foreman was a key player in the drama.

"I got hit and knocked out, so I can hardly remember anything," Foreman said, although he did recall that he went into the bout blithely confident of victory. eNCA

Phelps stumbles ahead of US Olympic trials

LOS ANGELES - Michael Phelps, aiming to add to his tally of 18 Olympic gold medals at the Rio de Janeiro Games, was beaten again on Saturday at an invitational swimming meeting in Austin, Texas.

The 30-year-old US superstar came straight from hard training into the tuneup meet for the Olympic trials in Omaha this month

He finished fourth in the 200m freestyle won by Townley Haas in 1min 47.86sec, with Phelps, clocking 1min 48.73.

The setback came a day after Phelps won the 100m free and finished second to Singapore's Joseph Schooling in the 100m butterfly.

The meeting is one of three elite events this weekend where US swimmers are warming up for the demands of trials, and overseas competitors are prepping for the Rio Games themselves.

In other Austin action, American Chase Kalisz posted the third-fastest time in the world this year in the 400m individual medley, winning in 4:11.51.

Allison Schmitt defeated Missy Franklin for the second straight night, triumphing in the 200m free in 1:56.87 to Franklin's 1:57.78.

Franklin won the 200m backstroke in 2:09.45.

At the Indianapolis Pro Swim, American David Plummer notched the fastest time in the world this year in the 100m backstroke, winning in a sizzling 52.40sec.

"We've been working a ton on holding tempo, trying to get that speed up to where it needs to be and just holding it right at the quickest tempo I can hold," Plummer said.

"I feel like it's really starting to come around."

At the Pro Swim in Santa Clara, California, Emma McKeon won the women's 50m free in 24.85, leading an Australian one-two finish ahead of Brittany Elmslie.

Federer, Del Potro test injuries on grass


STUTTGART - Roger Federer and Juan Martin del Potro will test injuries as the Wimbledon run-up period begins today at the Stuttgart Open grass event.

BARCELONA - The Catalunya MotoGP was hit by tragedy, when Moto2 rider Luis Salom died after an accident during the second practice session for Sunday's race.

The 24-year-old Spaniard lost control of his bike on turn 12 of the Barcelona circuit. No other riders were involved but pictures indicated that Salom's bike left the track at high speed in the corner, which has an asphalt run-off section rather than a gravel trap.

Rider and bike collided with airbags at the edge of the circuit with little to slow them down. Medics reached the scene of the accident within minutes, where Salom was found to be in car-



diac arrest. A statement from MotoGP's medical director detailed frantic efforts to save him.

"CPR continued at the trackside for 18 minutes, but taking into consideration Salom's life threatening condition, a decision was taken to transport him by road in an ambulance," it said. "Treatment continued for an additional 40 minutes during the ambulance transfer, but oxygen saturation deteriorated." CNN


Massa came close to doubling his side's lead in the 24th minute when he unleashed a thunderous shot from a free-kick which tipped over the crossbar by Dambe.

fully he is going to score a lot of goals like he did at Leicester. Leicester manager Claudio Ranieri also admitted to an Italian

newspaper "Yes, it's all true."

Vardy only signed a new four-year contract with Leicester in February and is preparing to represent England at Euro 2016, which starts next week.

DJOKOVIC CRUSHES MURRAY

in four sets to claim French Open title at Roland Garros and complete career Grand Slam

PARIS - Andy Murray provided a tease that he could win an unlikely French Open title but was ultimately blown away as Novak Djokovic made history at Roland Garros.


The world No 1 subdued a brilliant opening from the 29 year-old Scot to win the final 3-6 6-1 6-2 6-4 and confirm his claims to be among the greatest players ever.

In taking a twelfth Grand Slam the Serb became only the third man ever to hold all four of the Major titles at once, completing the full house with a magnificent display that Murray could not equal.

He has now done something that the likes of Roger Federer and Rafael Nadal have been unable to do – carrying off the non-calendar Grand Slam as Rod Laver and Donald Budge did before him. The Novak Slam lives and could yet become a calendar quartet.

Murray threw everything he had at the first set to shock his opponent, but simply could not keep up that level of ultra-commitment in the face of a defiant Djokovic and a partisan crowd.

Every key indicator went the other way after that — the first serve, second serve, returns and winner count completely in the world number one's favour. Murray, forced back behind the baseline, tried to stay

calm, tried to get angry – especially with the overhead camera – but found himself comprehensively outplayed.

He should curse the fact that he was born only a week apart from this remarkable athlete, who showed

there is clear blue water between himself and the best of the rest, which is what Murray has again proved himself to be in this clay court season.

Fault

The Scot at least asked the ques-

tion at the end with a gutsy late surge, breaking back to 4-5 from 2-5 in the fourth set. Djokovic egged the crowd on as he felt his way to the finish line, and finally clinched it, after a nervey double fault and backhand error on his first two match points

Murray netted the third with a backhand, and climbed over the net to congratulate him before Djokovic drew a heart on the court and laid down in the middle of it.

Djokovic had walked out to the louder roar from the crowd, with Serbian flags being waved in all corners of Court Philippe Chatrier. Murray was trying to break his record of never having won on his first appearance at a particular Grand Slam final, and it was clear that he would be getting less encouragement on another grey and heavy day.

The Serb played as perfect a return game as could be imagined at the start, breaking to love. However, Murray's response was majestic, breaking him straight back with a deft backhand lob.

After an easy hold he broke for 3-1 when Djokovic sent a forehand long, although his problem had been whacking too many of them in the net. He actually seemed in shock at the quality coming at him from the other end.

Murray's only distraction was having French TV interviewer Nelson Monfort removed from his row of support crew but he kept his head to move to 5-3.

He had a spot of luck at 15-0 when umpire Damien Dumusois overruled a line call on second serve and, bravely but erroneously, gave Murray the point as the return went long. The whistling was deafening but again Murray kept his composure and took the set on a third set point when Djokovic netted a backhand.



SOCCER - ZIMBABWE beat Malawi 3-0 in Harare yesterday to qualify for the Africa Cup of Nations 2017 in Gabon, hindering the chances for Sihlangu to make their debut in the prestigious African soccer tournament.

'The Flames', as Malawi national team side is nicknamed, are sitting at the bottom of group L with two points from five matches and their hopes of reaching Gabon are over. The same applies to Guinea. Zimbabwe will play Guinea in their last match of the qualifying stage and the latter's triumph will make Swaziland's chances of finishing as best runners up even bigger. Kalisto Pasuwa's men now have 11 points on top of the group and have reached the continental showpiece after Guinea lost 1-0 to Sihlangu yesterday.



SOCCER - THE nation's pride Sihlangu proved superior over West African side Guinea after beating them 1-0 at the Somhlolo

National stadium yesterday.

I am really happy with their performance, even the youngsters in 'Pupu' and 'Mzoro', who came in as substitutes," he said.

Balance

"The plan was to find a balance between defending and attacking and we managed to do it. We also managed to destabilise their defence, especially from flanks where they were vulnerable," he said.

Quizzed on the performance of skipper Tony 'TT' Tsabedze, who was rested for Banele 'Pupu' Sikhondze, the coach said the winger would be back to his old self in no time.

"Tony is over his injury but just needs game time so he can regain his form. Otherwise, we still need his leadership skills in the team as our captain," he said.

Meanwhile, his Guinea counterpart Mohammed Bangoura said he was disappointed by his team's performance during the game.

"My team had difficulty in applying the game plan in this game and that worked against us. Swaziland were tactically disciplined and they gave us a tough time during the game," he said.
