

## ADY LAWYER DIVORCES, ETS BMW, ISUZU, FLATS

AN attorney has agreed to dissolve her marriage with a top accountant after it was agreed she will keep three properties and two motor vehicles, being properties attained during their union.

Buhle Si nelane was being divorced by her husband Musa Sabelo Mdluli for adultery.

The husband had initially wanted her to forfeit all the properties attained during their marriage entered into in 2002.

However, she had filed a counter claim

seeking an order dissolving her marriage with Mdluli because he had also committed adultery.

Simelane, however, decided not to challenge Mdluli's divorce application after they had agreed to enter into a settlement wherein they shared properties among themselves.

The matter was heard at the Mbabane Magistrate's Court where Simelane was represented by lawyer Sifiso Jele from Mabila Attorneys while lawyer Mandla Mdluli appeared on Musa's behalf.

The parties, who owned two town houses in Thembelihle and Dalriach townships and flats at Mpolonjeni, Nkoyoyo as well as Mdzimba agreed these should be shared.

They also agreed that Simelane would keep a BMW and an Isuzu for herself while Mdluli also kept another BMW and an Isuzu motor vehicle.

Agreed

It was agreed that Mdluli would keep the Thembelihle house and their marital home at Ngwazini, while Simelane would keep, for her own benefit, the flats at Mpolonjeni, Nkoyoyo and Mdzimba.

The house at Thembelihle, the parties agreed, would be kept for the benefit of their children and registered as a trust. Simelane would pay municipality rates while Mdluli would pay for its insurance.

The couple also agreed that Mdluli would keep all movables he had bought prior to and during the subsistence of the marriage. Meanwhile, Simelane is to also keep all movables she had bought, including a couch set, E30 000 cash, two fridges and three beds that were kept at their Thembelihle house.

She was given until January 31, 2017 to have vacated the house at Thembelihle and further sign all documentation granting ownership of the house to Mdluli.

Custody

"It is further agreed that the defendant (Simelane) will have custody of the minor children subject to unlimited visitation rights being afforded to the plaintiff (Mdluli), in particular on weekends and during school vacations," read the agreement.

Mdluli, it was agreed, would pay E3 000 monthly for the maintenance of the children and pay school fees for them as well.

#### Mdladla the best, CEO tells probe team

**EZULWINI Town Council Chief Executive** Officer (CEO) Vusmutiwendvodza Matsebula said engaging lawyer S'dumo Mdladla from SV Mdladla and Associates was good for the local authority.

Matsebula was speaking on Monday before the Commission of Enquiry that is tasked with a job of looking into the cause of the impasse within Ezulwini Town Council.

Matsebula said Mdladla's law firm was charging them reasonable amounts of money.

He also stated that in terms of expertise, this law firm was one of those they could rely upon as and its lawyers were experienced in the legal corporate field.

Matsebula had been accused of flouting tendering procedure to engage Mdladla's law firm to continue giving legal services to the town. However, he refuted this.

He is said to have written a letter to Mdladla, with an intention to renew his contract with the Ezulwini Town Council. Mdladla's contract had expired in March this year.

Matsebula was accused of doing this without informing the Ezulwini councillors.

But the CEO disputed the allegations in front of the commission.

He said there were many law firms that had been roped in since 2009, when Mdladla was awarded a contract.

Some of the lawyers they engaged included Maduduza Zwane and Zonke Magagula. He said from 2013, they paid Mdladla a total amount of E342 642.83 in legal fees.

He also said it was not correct to say Mdladla was providing legal services to them for 15 years because as far as he knew, Mdladla was first engaged by the Council in 2009.

"The problem here is that all the legal fees were forked out by the Council were attributed

to Mdladla yet there are many law firms that were engaged and paid.

"What is surprising is that even all the legal fees paid to all the firms we engaged do not add up to E1 million that had been alleged before this commission.

They only add up to E482 436.12," Matsebula said. The reason Matsebula decided to write to Mdladla was because the attorney was supposed to continue with the work he had started while he was still contracted to the Council.

He only wrote a letter to find out if he was still interested in finishing off the cases he had represented them in while the contract was still valid.

Matsebula said there was a time when the Council did not have a case in court during Mdladla's tenure as a legal advisor for the coun-

He blamed the Council's financial committee Chairperson, Councillor Nokuthula Mthembu. for playing a role in the many cases that were pending in court.

He found it unfair to blame Mdladla for all the court cases pending against the Council because it was not him that was responsible for all these

#### ... CONFUSION OVER SENATOR'S INVOLVEMENT IN IMPASSE

THERE is confusion over how Senator David Duma Dlamini was roped in for the conflict resolution exercise at Ezulwini Town Council.

The ministry of housing and urban development, after realising there was a conflict in Ezulwini, had suggested that the CEO and the councillors should go for a team building exercise.

The reason for that was to ensure the CEO with his councillors worked in a peaceful and harmonious way for the development of the town. However, it was difficult to find a person that would facilitate the exercise for them.

The council Chairperson

Busi Bhembe met with Minister for Housing and Development Urban Phiwavinkhosi Mabuza to find the right person who could help them facilitate the team building exercise.

Mabuza is said to have identified Senator David Dlamini as the rightful person to facilitate such an exercise.

However, Dlamini could not facilitate the team building exercise, but allegedly offered a conflict resolution exercise. That happened around October this year, yet the suggestion came around May when the Council was having one of its statutory meetings.

When Bhembe called the

office of the CEO to inform him that Senator David Dlamini was the one to conduct the conflict resolution exercise, Matsebula rejected it.

The reason why he rejected such was that the rightful procedures had not been followed.

The officials from the ministry of housing and urban development advised that it would be wrong to involve the minister in finding a person who would facilitate the conflict resolution exercise. Ngambuta kutsi sewumtsetsephi lo Duma Dlamini (I asked where she got the mandate to rope in Duma Dlamini)," Matsebula said.

#### E150 000 Ezulwini project goes down the drain

THE impasse at Ezulwini Town Council might be responsible for the loss of a E150 000 developmental project for Ezulwini.

This was revealed on Monday during a hearing before a Commission of Enquiry that was tasked to look into the causes of the impasse at Ezulwini Town Council.

The commission was appointed by Minister for Housing and Urban Development Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza.

CEO Matsebula said the E150 000 would be gained once he took part in the Young African Leaders Initiative (YALI) conference in Johannesburg, South Africa.

Matsebula said he was frustrated when he was supposed to go for that conference because it was taking forever for him to get approval from the

#### Conference

He said he was supposed to go on October 8 for the conference and Chairperson Busi Bhembe had known about this on October 2.

He said when he saw that the date

for him to go was drawing closer, he contacted American Embassy Public Affairs Manager Ruth Newman. Newman agreed to write an e-mail to Bhembe, asking her to release Matsebula for the conference.

The e-mail Newman wrote was to the effect that the conference would benefit Ezulwini. In the e-mail, Newman also said she had a feeling that the Ezulwini town would have other long term benefits.

Those benefits would outweigh the sacrifices of having the CEO leave his work to attend the conference. Matsebula said that e-mail was not responded to.

He then decided to contact the Principal Secretary in the Ministry, Clifford

Mamba advised Matsebula to contact Minister Mabuza so that he could contact Mayor Busi Bhembe so at the end, Matsebula could be released.

Matsebula called the minister and they finally agreed to let the CEO go. Matsebula said he got a call from Bhembe on the day he was supposed

to leave.

When he got the call, he was driving past Mafutseni, on his way to King Mswati III International Airport to catch a flight at 2pm.

He said he had gone to the airport with the belief that Bhembe would call her and let her go.

If he had not received the call, he would not have gone.

He then decided to abandon the F150 000 project in fear he would not get the support needed to implement the project.

JOHANNESBURG - Gospel singer Sfiso Newane will be laid to rest in his home province, KwaZulu-Natal.

The family spokesperson, Sipho Makhabane, confirmed to TshisaLIVE that the funeral service will take place at 9am at the Moses Mabhida Stadium in Durban this Saturday, December 10.

There will be two memorial services for the late gospel icon, one in Durban and one in Johannesburg.

The one in Durban will take place at the Ethekwini Community Church (ECC) on Thursday, December 8 at 11am.

The family has not yet confirmed the venue for the Johannesburg memorial service, however, it's set to be held on Friday, December 9. #### The Sfiso I knew before 'Kulungile Baba'

JOHANNESBURG-"In 2003, I joined a band called New Edition, in Umlazi, south of Durban. By then, I had already been a piano player for a decade.

At the time, no one told me that the band had a partnership agreement with Sfiso Newane, who had already made hits that captured the nation, such as 'Makadunyiswe'.

After months playing with New Edition, on one Thursday, Sfiso arrived at the garage for a rehearsal.

He was a calm musician who was willing to work with anyone. I moved away from the keyboards as I wanted to learn as much from him as I could.

We sang one song he had written for the group, titled 'Lapho Kukhona Abahluphekile'. I was surprised that he could visit us in such a place. Our rehearsal venue was not your normal studio setup. It was a garage. Our group was poor and we had not make a breakthrough in the industry. The garage had a nagging stinking smell from the five dogs that lived in it and guarded the house owner's car. That did not matter to Sfiso. He just loved the music we played together.

He was already famous by then, but that didn't mean anything to him either. When it came to music, he gave it his all, no matter who the audience was and how many people turned up.

One day, he brought us to a com-

munity hall in Adams on the South Coast. We were one of the curtain-raisers on the day. He did not have a backing vocalist, so he performed to music from a CD. And boy, did he give it his all.

Sfiso sang all his great hits to an audience that was made up of primary school kids, a few teenagers and grannies.

He jumped from the stage onto the floor and began dancing with the children — a moment they cherished. Most of the cellphones those days did not take pictures. So, for the children it was about touching and dancing with him, a gospel star they normally see on

Ntombifuthi Mntambo, one of the lead vocalists in New Edition, knew him well.

"Our drummer in New Edition, Skhumbuzo Gumede, was his homeboy from Mthwalume. They met in town and Newane immediately told him he would come and see us. He came to our rehearsals and later we signed a deal for him to take us to Joburg to record an album. At the studio, he wrote us a great song titled 'Lapho Kukhona' Abahluphekile', 'Thumela uMoya Wakho'," Mntambo explained.

She added that the group and Sfiso had their share of problems, something normal in the music industry, but the New Edition members remember him most for his passion for music. TMG Digital

THERE was a two-folded drama when a 23-year old man attempted to stage an armed robbery right inside a moving bus where he shot once to the roof of the public vehicle to scare his prey. That's the first drama.

The second one played itself out when the bus driver and his conductor pulled over the bus and went for the armed young man who clearly was terrified at that moment.

They wrestled with the young man and disarmed him before tying him up and drove with him and the passengers to the bus rank. At the bus rank, bafana bemdlazi as conductors are known were set on the young robber. He was beaten to a pulp. According to traumatised eye witnesses, the man whose name is known to the publication but cannot be revealed before he appears before court, got into the bus like a normal passenger in the company of two other men.

They suspected nothing, really. The bus was from Gundvwini headed for Manzini.

As the bus approached Ngwane Park, the suspect pulled out a gun from a bag he was carrying, shot once to the roof of the bus and demanded that the passengers give



him money and surrender their cell phones: "

He said a charge of possessing a firearm was laid against the suspect. He further confirmed that when police arrived they found the suspect bleeding profusely.



## Brothers assault, parade their own mother naked

IN one of the worst harassment cases against parents, two brothers have been hauled before court and accused of parading their biological mother stark naked after accusing her of unbecoming behaviour.

The brothers; Mbongeni Muntu Makhanya (28), who is a member of the Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF), and Ayanda (24) are said to have shamelessly assaulted their mother, Lomcwasho Makhanya. while forcing her to confess having conducted herself in an inappropriate manner.

The allegations made by the two brothers cannot be repeated here due to their serious nature.

The harassment against the elderly woman is alleged to have torn the entire family apart, resulting to the abused woman and her husband seeking the court's intervention.

In a sworn statement, the parents of the two young men narrated that their lives were now in danger due to threats made by the respondents (the two brothers).

A peace-binding application was yesterday presented before Principal Magistrate Dumsani Magagula, where Lomcwasho and her husband (Dumsani) were seeking a court order barring their sons from ever coming anywhere near their parental homestead again.

Details of the matter included that the elder son has been harassing his mother constantly, demanding she pays back an undisclosed amount of money which he had borrowed her some time ago.

Mbongeni is alleged to have at an

instance impounded a motor vehicle belonging to his parents and took it to his work place as a way of forcing his mother to pay back the money. He is also said to have further taken away keys and a blue book belonging to another motor vehicle as a way to make sure that his mother remained grounded.

#### Assault

All this was done while their father was away at his work place. The assault and naked parade of their mother is reported to have also been undertaken while her husband was away. The woman and her husband therefore asked the court to prevent the two brothers from attaching any property or having any kind of communication with them hereafter.

Meanwhile, Mbongeni acknowledged before the court that he was actually 'reprimanding' his mother from her unbecoming behaviour which was putting the image of the family in disrepute. He further acknowledged demanding a pay-back of his money from his mother.

Upon considering the merits of the matter, the principal magistrate first expressed his shock on the behaviour of the two brothers, saying it was unheard of.

Magagula stated that such behaviour was neither Swazi nor civil. He then issued five restricting orders against the two brothers. This included that Mbongeni must surrender back the motor vehicle which he took from his parents.

He is further barred from communicating with both his mother and father either in person or through a telephone call. Both respondents were further barred from going to their parental home with immediate effect.

### Tragedy as girl (5) downs at pre-school

A Larn Pre-School graduation ceremony turned sour after a little girl drowned during the proceedings of the event yesterday.

The incident happened around 1:30pm at the pre-school situated at Thembelihle in Mbabane. The five-year-old was found unconscious in the school swimming pool while parents were busy with the proceedings of the school graduation.

Witnesses at the scene weren't sure how long she had been underwater but they suspected she stayed for long as paramedics and doctors, who were present, performed first aid on her for nearly 15 minutes. "However, the first aid did not help as she was too weak and died on the spot," said a source. She was transported to Mbabane Government Hospital, where

she was certified dead.

It is alleged the little girl went swimming alone in the pool and the school authorities noted late that she was missing. "A search party began. After nearly a 15 minutes' search, it was discovered she was trapped by the pool side."

The witness said some of the parents attending the graduation were doctors and tried all they could to rescue the situation, but it was late.

#### Contain

She said everything had to stop and owner of the pre-school, who is described as of Asian origin, couldn't contain herself as she broke down in front of the other children and parents.

"In this situation no one is to

be blamed since the teachers maybe were a bit lax as they believed their parents were around."

THE guardian of the deceased little girl was informed of the sad news over the phone as she was absent during the graduation.

The grandmother of the minor was telephoned by the school authorities and was further asked to rush to the hospital as an accident had occurred and the minor was rushed there.

## HOW CLEAN ARE MANZINI PUBLIC TOILETS?

CUSTOMARY, the festive is a season of the year during which the kingdom's vibrant Hub gets an influx of visitors - be it for shopping, business or leisure.

Well, it goes without saying that during this time of the year, even facilities of public convenience such as the municipal public toilets usually become a hive of activity.

Question is; how clean and userfriendly are the Manzini municipal public toilets? Are they ready to absorb the thousands of visitors that Council expects this festive? Well, 12 per cent of the 52 000 people who were covered during the Municipal Council of Manzini-commissioned customer satisfaction survey, which was carried out late last year, were not so happy about the condition of these facilities. They felt that Council needed to pull-up her socks regarding the overall management and cleanliness of these precious facilities.

Just in case you are unaware dear reader, Council is responsible for two public toilets within the Manzini Main Bus Rank (one located near the buses loading/offloading zone and another within the bus rank shopping complex), one behind the President Centre shopping complex, another within the King Somhlolo Park (former Jubilee Park), another at the Manzini Market and another within the Satellite Bus Rank. The ones within the Manzini Market were actually fingered to be the most attention-requiring.

Manzini News took time to engage the Municipal Council regarding this issue and it was acknowledged that indeed the high user volumes made it uneasy to keep the toilets in a good state of cleanliness. However, Council was doing the best it could under the circumstances.

It was also gathered that Council had developed a comprehensive cleaning plan and specific officers were tasked with ensuring it was followed. As to whether or not this intervention is yielding the desired results, you, dear reader, can be the judge. Drop us an email on pro@mzcity council.sz or an SMS or WhatsApp on 7611 4191 and tell us whether or not the situation has improved following this intervention. It must be mentioned, however, that Council has also noted a number of unbecoming behaviour amongst users of these facilities; which make things

even worse. These range from failure to close taps after usage of the sinks, resulting in an overflow of water, theft of mirrors, door locks, water pipes, taps, failure to use the flushing system after use of the toilet and - incredible as it may be theft of even the entire cistern. This indecent behaviour is dragging Manzini miles away from vision 2022 and has to stop immediately. If you happen to spot such behaviour, please immediately alert the toilet attendant or the police. Nawe uliphoyisa. We all have a role to play towards ending this barbarous behaviour.

#### STAKEHOLDERS SEE IMPROVEMENT IN PROCESSING OF HEALTH CERTIFICATES

The city-wide customer satisfaction survey, which was commissioned by the Municipal Council of Manzini late last year, has revealed a sense of satisfaction with regard the turnaround times in the processing of health certificates. A total of 21 per cent of the 52 000 people that were covered by the survey gave this service offering a thumbs up. Others noted, even though there was a certain level of improvement, Council needs to beef up its health inspection team in order to perfect the turnaround time. You will recall, dear reader, that one of the requirements for a trading licence is that the businessperson must acquire a health certificate from the Municipal Council of Manzini.

The certificate is confirmation that Council has inspected the premises in which the business is to be operated and is satisfied about its state of hygiene. Without this certification, it becomes impossible to have the trading licence granted by the ministry of commerce, industry and trade. In the past, the business sector had complained it was taking rather too long to get this certificate. Fortunately, Council has confirmed the reduction in the turnaround time. She told Manzini News that she had set a three-day turnaround time for processing of health certificate applications. Apparently, an efficient tool for tracking and expediting applications has been developed. Council is trying by all means to perfect this new system through addressing of all glitches. A marked improvement was also noted in routine inspection of food establishments. A total of 27 per cent survey respondents were of the view that the food grading programme that had recent-

ity was yielding the desired magic. However, some grey areas were noted in respect of shops operated by businesspeople of Asian origin; in particular the fact that some were used for dual purposes - business and residential. On enquiry, Manzini News was told that Council had indeed noted that some business establishments were used for residential and business purposes and stern action was taken against offenders.

#### MAJORITY HAPPY WITH WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE

A majority of respondents in a customer satisfaction survey commissioned by the Municipal Council of Manzini late last year have revealed they are smitten about the quality of service in relation to waste collection in the city. They apparently like the fact that even when refuse trucks are down, Council makes it a point that the refuse collection team works till late in the evening to ensure all waste is eventually collected. They,



however, urged Council to convinuality Methally challenged were continualnicate in time whenever the trucks were down so they do not have to take the garbage out for collection as it ends up being messed up by stray dogs. Manzini News spoke to Council about this and was told the local government had adopted an SMS notification system as one of the means of communication with stakeholders. Residents, both property owners and tenants, who do not receive these notifications, were advised to furnish Council with their cellphone numbers so they can be included in the database.

#### OTHER THORNY ISSUES: NOISY BARS, STRAY ANIMALS, BUSHY **VACANT PLOTS**

If results of the customer satisfaction survey are anything to go by; noisy beer halls, stray animals and overgrown vacant plots continue to be thomy issues within Manzini municipality. A total of 23 per cent respondents decried noise pollution that is caused by out-of-control beer halls. quad bikes and loud music from vehicles. At least 16 per cent lamented lack of effective measures to deal with stray cattle and dogs; citing Ngwane Park, Zakhele, Fairview, Extension 7 and Madonsa as the most troubled townships. They also lamented the presence of mentally challenged persons in the city. Ten percent lamented overgrown undeveloped plots as causing discomfort to neighbouring properties. ## NEPHEW KILLER CHALLENGES COURT'S 15-YEAR SENTENCE

HARDLY a week after he was sentenced to 15 years for killing his nephew, a man has challenged High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze's judgment.

Elliot Mamba had been sentenced by the judge on November 28, 2016 for having killed Sidwell Methula on January 8, 2009. Mamba is not pleased with the judgment on conviction and the sentencing and has submitted 14 things he believes were committed irregularly by the trial judge.

The judge had convicted him to murder but found that there were factors that reduced Mamba's moral blameworthiness. This, the judge said, was because Mamba had been provoked and attacked by Methula first before he drew a Rambo knife and stabbed him.

Mamba is represented by Sifiso Jele from Mabila Attorneys. He said the High Court committed an error in law and in fact when it convicted him for murder when there was evidence to prove provocation and that he had been acting in self defence.

He has also submitted that the trial court misdirected itself by finding that there had been proof beyond reasonable doubt that the charge was murder yet the crown's evidence was contradictory. He submitted that the court itself, had acknowledged the contradictions of the crown's evidence in its judgment.

"The court a quo misdirected itself

in law in accepting the evidence of the third witness without having exercised due caution. She, being a minor at the time and whose presence at the scene was disputed by the crown's own evidence and whose evidence was not corroborated," Mamba said in his judgment.

He also argued that the young witness had stated that she was with Methula and a third person, but the said third person was never called to lead evidence before court.

He further argued that it was an error of law for the High Court to find that he ought to have reasonably foreseen that his acts could lead to Methula's death yet the evidence did not align with such finding.

Mamba also said the High Court misdirected itself when handing down the sentence because it failed to take into account that he stabbed him in self defence after Methula had hurled insults at him and attacked him with a knobkerrie. He also said the High Court did not consider that he first fought with Methula and the latter had struck first. He said the court ought to have considered that had Methula not attacked him, he would not have stabbed him.

"The court a quo ought to have taken into consideration that the deceased himself was carrying a knobkerrie, which knobkerrie he was using during the fight. He said the court imposed a lengthy sentence yet it had found that there were no aggravating factors. He said, the least he should have been convicted for, was culpable homicide."

#### Ngwenya Town Board sues Peterstow E76 000

NGWENYA Town Board is suing the liquidated Peterstow Aquapower for over E76 000 in respect of outstanding rates.

Peterstow Aquapower was liquidated about two years ago after failing to meet its financial obligations.

It operated at Ngwenya and manufactured industrial machinery for export.

The Ngwenya Town Board has instituted legal proceedings against the company seeking an order for payment of outstanding rates.

The company, has however, opposed the application.

It is yet to file papers detailing reasons for the opposition.

The town board has instructed Howe, Masuku, Nsibande Attorneys in the matter.

Petros Nxumalo, the town board's Treasurer, in an affidavit, has claimed that the company owed E76 916.42 in respect of rates, and interest accrued over a period of time in respect of remainder of portion 6 of farm 1209 at Ngwenya.

He claimed that the town board had complied with Section 32 (2) of the Rating Act in that it filed an application directing the company to pay outstanding rates.

He claimed the court judgment was issued in favour of the board.

However, he said the judgment was entered by a clerk of court. He applied that the company be ordered to pay the owed amount and by that order the town board would be able to execute it.

The matter had been filed as an urgent application, but after Peterstow Aquapower had filed a notice of intention to oppose, it was enrolled to take the normal court process.

The matter is pending before court.



## THUGS BREAK INTO BUY CASH HARDWARE, STEAL E100 000

THUGS broke into Buy Cash Hardware store in Pigg's Peak and stole over E100 000 in cash and other items in the early hours of yesterday morning.

The store is situated directly opposite the Pigg's Peak Police Station and workers were seen camped outside the shop as police conducted their work of investigating.

According to sources close to the matter, the break-in happened in the morning hours, right under the Pigg's Peak police noses.

A source who works at Buy Cash

said it remained a mystery how the thugs could break into the shop which is a stone's throw from the Pigg's Peak Police Station.

"I am totally baffled how the thugs could break into a shop just opposite the police station. The details of the robbery are also inconclusive but we are yet to get the report because we just found the police inside the shop this morning," he said.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Mulani Mamba confirmed the breakinr, saying the details of the robbery were still sketchy as they were investigating.

"Unfortunately, details of the robbery cannot be forwarded at the moment because investigations are still ongoing. All I can say is that the robbery did take place and over E100 000 in cash was stolen as well some other items," he said.

Manager of Buy Cash Hardware store in Pigg's Peak Ackel Lukhele confirmed the break-in, saying the police were still working on the case. "I will not give out any details of the beak-in just yet as I was told by the Pigg's Peak police not to disturb their investigations, we just want everything to return to normal for now," he said.

Lukhele later stated that any details would be forwarded to the media once the company saw it fit to do so.

#### Big Men Security suspends 5 guards

ABOUT five of 13 Pigg's Peak Big Men Security guards have been suspended and are currently awaiting their disciplinary hearings for allegedly reporting their grievances to the media.


The security guards in question were tasked with securing the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital and complained, along with others that their employer, Big Men Security, had failed to pay the balance of their October wages and had not yet organised their November pay.

According to the security guards, who approached the Pigg's Peak Swazi Observer offices yesterday morning, after the article in which they aired their grievances, their administration called them all to the company's head offices in Mbabane to address them.

"After the article was published, our employer informed all 13 of us to go to our head offices in Mbabane, where we were paid our full November and October wages but were also handed suspension letters," said one of them.

The guards stated that the suspension letters were just nit-picking at minor issues; with the main reason being that the security personnel had reported their grievances to the media as seen in a photograph of the letter sent to the Swazi Observer Pigg's Peak office.

"The company is exacting vengeance on us for reporting our grievances to the newspaper. They are saying by doing so, we




brought the company's name into disrepute. We were surprised by this because all we said in that article was nothing but the truth. We had gone for almost two months without receiving any pay."

Managing Director (MD) of Big Men Security Sicelo Magagula did not answer his cellphone when the Swazi Observer Pigg's Peak office tried to reach him for a comment yesterday.

His secretary at the company's main office in Mbabane stated that Magagula was busy and all the other officers were out checking sites and had left their cellphones in the office.

## 'DVULADVULA' HIKES GOVT WAGE BILL BY E345 MILLION

GOVERNMENT had to folk out an extra E345 986 576 to finance the civil servant salary review, which was effected on July 1.

This has been revealed by the ministry of public service performance report for the second quarter 2016/2017.

The report states that in July, the ministry of public service wage bill escalated to E771 011 915 from E452 573 847 in June 2016, depicting an additional actual amount of a real E318 438 068 attributable to the implementation of the salary review.

The wage bill escalated by 24.1%.

The net effect of the salary review between the financial year 2015/2016 and 2016/2017 and within the six months in scrutiny shows an amount of E550 757 579, resulting in a difference of over E1.1 billion if one could project the impact of the salary review on an annual basis.

the wage bill declined by 16.3% to E522 644 973 while in September it had a slight increase of 16.7% to E534 383 757. A trend of just above 14% for the three months

before the implementation of the salary review is noticeable. The report furthers states that the total allowances for the year from April to June 2016 is between E48 million and E70 million and glaringly shot up to E291 083 014 during the month of July 2016. "This is attributed to the salary review implementation as well as arrears on some of the allowances, which were paid during the same month. An amount of E243 046 725 shown on the variances table depicts how much the allowances increased in July 2016 when compared

The report further states that in August decrease of about E224 014 658 on allowances during the month of August alludes to the fact that most of the allowances paid in the month of July were only arrears and not

associated with the salary review implementation. On the other hand, allowances that will increase with the adjusted salaries were manifest during the month of August and September 2016 whereby the table shows E67 068 356 and E53 955

329 respectively.

There are several allowances that are paid during the month of July 2016 and to name but a few are those of the ministry of health 10% stand-by allowances," states the report.

Stand-by allowances hike wage bill

THE ministry of public service performance report for the second quarter 2016/2017 further states that several allowances which were paid in July hiked the wage bill.

It states that the ministry of health's 10% stand-by allowances are one of the factors that contributed to the hike in total allowances during the month of July 2016.

"During the financial year 2016/2017 the table shows zero 10% standby allowances paid during the month of April to June 216 and an amount of E1 289 169 paid during the month of July 2016 and just E265 310 on August 2016. There is a sterling figure of about E37 million paid as 10% standby allowance during the financial year 2015/2016 and that a figure is as a result of doctors on-call allowances there," states the report.

The report also states that housing allowances were also one factor that contributed to the hiking of the allowances budget during the month of July to a certain

"One should recall that the salary

review saw some positions assuming new higher grades altogether and those new grades attracted higher housing allowances as well. The housing allowance is stable at an average of E8 575 767 during the April, May and June but rose to E9 321 343 in July. This shows an increase of about E1.1 million in allowance which further aggravated to an increase of about E3.1 million during the month of August 2016," states the report.

#### Allowance

The glaring increase in housing allowance in August is attributed to housing allowance arrears of E2 434 942 33 paid by the ministry of health to some of its officers during the same month of August 2016.

The police allowance also contributed to the July 2016 increase of a total allowances as it pumped in an increase in an amount of around E1.1 million when compared to all the months before the salary review implementation. "The amount escalated from E6 300 000 between April and June 2016 to E7 300 000 after the implementation of the salary review in

KING Mswati III International Airport recorded a hike of 3 000 cross-border travellers in a space of three months.

This is contained in the ministry of home affairs second quarter performance report for 2016/2017.

The ministry's first quarter performance report for 2016/2017 revealed that between April and June, there was a total of 13 855 cross border travellers at KM III, while in the second quarter 16 799 were recorded for the month of July to September, 2016.

In the second quarter, KM III recorded a total number of 8 310 arrivals between the month of July and September and a total number of 8 489 of departures. While on the first quarter, KM III had 6 717 arrivals between the month of April and June and recorded 7 138 of departures.

Meanwhile, during the same period. Matsapha Airport recorded 389 arrivals and 403 departures, which also indi-

cated a hike of 393 when compared to the first quarter.

On the other hand, the country had 1.6 million cross-border travellers between July and September 2016 on land border posts.

South Africa had the highest number of cross border travellers, standing at 1 436 370 while Mozambique had 168

The report revealed that most travellers travelled through the Ngwenya/Oshoek border, followed by Lavumisa. In the three months, Ngwenya recorded 285 768 arrivals, while Lavumisa had 96 149. The border post with the least visitors was Lundzi, which recorded 2 149.

#### Defence PS in bilateral talks with Moza

**DESPITE** limited financial resources at his disposal, veteran Principal Secretary Andreas Mathabela, continues to effectively execute the mandate of his office at the ministry of national defence and security.

Mathabela, one of the most senior principal secretaries in the country, is reportedly providing muchneeded executive directorship and common services to the Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF) with limited financial resources.

In the face of common threats to Swazi nationals and their Mozambican counterparts, Mathabela reportedly headed a security delegation for the inaugural session of the Mozambique-Swaziland Joint Permanent Commission on Defence and Security.

"The session provided both parties with an opportunity to enhance our bilateral cooperation and harmonise a mechanism for defence and security sector interaction in the face of common threats to our nations and people," stated the ministry in its second quarter performance report.

Mathabela, himself a former security officer having served as King Sobhuza II's bodyguard, also attended the 18th meeting of the ministerial committee of the organ on politics, defence and security coop-

The main objective of this meeting was to review, amongst others, the new strategic indicative plan for the organ.

The plan was reportedly discussed as well as status of ratification and or accession to the protocols related to the organ on politics, defence and security cooperation, report on the implementation of summit decisions; reports on the political and security situation in the region, debate on matters relating to the consolidation of democracy in the region and issues pertaining to the development of SADC's capacity for mediation, conflict and prevention of diplomacy.

## KEGIƏTEKED

A total of 94 divorces were registered between the month of July and September.

All the divorces were registered at the Mbabane headquarters. In July 24, divorces were registered, 26 in August and 44 in September. Meanwhile, between July and September there were 1 261 marriages in all the country's regions. Of the total, 601 were civil marriages while 661 were Swazi Law and Custom marriages. "The marriage registrations are current, late certificate and certified copies," states the report.

#### 15 500 TRAVEL DOCUMENTS ISSUED

THE second quarter also saw 15 527 travel documents issued between the months of July and september.

to retusion these figures, 41.8% of the travel documents were issued in Mbabane and 20.6% in Manzini. In the month of July, Mbabane issued 2 252 travel documents, in August 2 737 while in September the ministry issued 2 130 travel doc-

In Manzini, the month of July saw 1 119 travel documents issued, 1 470 in August and 933 in September. The least issued travel documents were issued at Luve and Lomahasha. In the three months, 46 travel documents were issued at Luve while Lomahasha had 136.

The report further reveals that these numbers cover only issued travel documents not those printed.

"There are a lot of printed travel documents awaiting collection by applicants, and or bearers from the various service centres strategically located around the country," it

## Drink-driving should be a criminal offence - MVA

THE Sincephetelo Motor Vehicle Accidents (MVA) Fund has called for a law that will see certain traffic offences being moved to the category of criminal offences amongst which is drinking and driving.

MVA Chief Executive Officer Helmon Vilakati said the structuring of a law that clarifies such as a criminal offence would help create a sense of responsibility on fun lovers to make informed decisions before getting behind the wheel when intoxicated.

At the present moment, driving under the influence of alcohol is categorised as a traffic offence and comes with less harsh sentences while criminal offences are a bit harsher.

The CEO was represented by MVA's Dumisa Dlamini on Saturday during a prayer hosted by the Hhohho Christian Police Association.

It was held at the Mater Dolorosa High School hall soon after a march from Masakhane.

"MVA wishes that lawmakers would come up with a law that would see drinking amongst other traffic offences being categorised under criminal

offences. We feel this would help lower the number of cases that are recorded because of irresponsible decisions by drivers," he said, before adding that such cases crippled the country's economy.

#### Crime prevention

On the other hand, Senior Superintendent, Simon Mamba, who spoke on behalf of the National Commissioner Isaac Magagula, said in their crime prevention plan for this year's festive season, they had outlined two focal areas they would give their time to.

One of them was the deployment of large numbers of officers around the country to prevent any possible misdemeanours, whilst the other is having numerous routine roadblocks throughout the season.

Mamba said the reason Magagula had decided there should be more police deployed was because this played a major role in crime prevention in the sense that the mere

visibility prevented any would be wrongdoers from continuing with committing the crime in fear of being apprehended.

'This can be best derived from one officer's experiences when he had gone to England where he said police were everywhere and those who loitered around the streets without clear intentions were questioned on such to create a safe environment for the people," he said.


He said this was in no way means of infringing on the public's rights but it was efforts to create a safe environment for all during this busy peri-

Most of these teachers are reportedly facing charges under the Education Act.

## PATRON STABBED AT MSHAYAZAFE BAR IN CRITICAL CONDITION

A patron is fighting for his life at the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital after he was stabbed with a 'Rambo' knife at Mshayazafe Bar last Saturday night.

It was a case of a drinking spree turning nasty.

Mshayazafe Bar is one of the popular drinking spots in Matsapha.

It is said two people were stabbed during a brawl between two groups who were enjoying their alcoholic beverages on the night.

Information gathered is that the fight ensued when one patron who was drinking with friends tried to mug another patron who happens to be a kombi driver. It is claimed the kombi driver fought back and the fight was joined by others and soon the place turned into a free for all as beer bottles were used and knives were drawn by the fighting patrons. It is alleged that Sibonelo Zwane who was trying to pickpocket the kombi driver drew a 'Rambo' knife and stabbed the victim all over the body and in the

However, during the skirmish the driver was able to overpower the wouldbe robber and stabbed him using his own knife

According to witnesses, police and an

ambulance were called as some of the fighting parties lay on the ground powerless and bleeding.

It is said some of the wounded were taken to hospital where they were treated. One person Mbuso Nkambule who is a kombi driver has been arrested in connection with the incident,

Nkambule made his first court appearance on Monday before Manzini Senior Magistrate Sindisile Zwane.

Nkambule who had stab wounds all

over the body and face was accused of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

His bail was opposed as the complainant was in a critical condition in hospital. Nkambule tried to negotiate for bail stating that he com-

mitted the offence in self defence. The accused told the magistrate that he was being robbed by the complainant who took out a knife and stabbed him all over the body.

"Bekangibamba inkunzi ngatsatsa lomukhwa wakhe," narrated the accused

Nkambule told the court that he fought back and stabbed the victim with his own knife. He added that he believed he should be admitted to bail since he has to get treatment for his wounds which are all over the body. The magistrate warned the accused that the law does not allow him to be admitted to bail because the complainant was in a critical condition in hospital.

Victim Magistrate Zwane told the accused

that should it happen that the victim does not make it in hospital the accused would face a charge of murder which is why it should be ascertained first whether the complainant is recovering or

The accused was remanded back into police custody and told to appear at the Matsapha Circuit court on December 13. Chief Police Information

and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba confirmed that such a matter was reported and the accused has already made his court appearance. When probed about the condition of the stabbed victim Chief PICO stated that he was still in a critical condition in hospital.

## Man kidnapped, robbed at knife point in Quantum

FOUR people have been arrested for kidnapping a man by bungling him into a Toyota Quantum and driving off with him while threatening to stab him with a knife if he does not cooperate.

The Incident is said to have happened at Ntontozi at Etinyangeni area last Saturday. Information gathered is that the four, Majaha Shabangu (30) of Ludzeludze, Phiwokwakhe Simelane (24) of Mhlaleni, Samkeliso Mndzebele (28) of KaBhudla and Ncamiso Dlamini (30) of Mhlaleni were travelling in a Toyota Quatum registered NSD 442 BH when they kidnapped the victim Celumusa Mkhonta and drove around with him demanding money.

#### Offences

The accused made their first court appearance before Manzini Senior Magistrate Sindisile Zwane and were accused of two counts of criminal offences.

In the first count they were accused of kidnapping in that they all acted jointly and with a common purpose took and car-



ried away Celumusa Mkhonta with a Toyota Quantum with the intention of depriving him his liberty while at Ntontozi area. Stole

On the second count, the accused were charged with robbery in that they threatened Mkhonta with a knife and stole from him money amounting to E138.

During their court appearance the accused told the magistrate that they will conduct their own defence. They were remanded back into police custody and told to appear before court on December 14, the prosecutor handling the case told the accused that bail is opposed.







## SPUR TRAINEE FIRED AFTER E368 SALARY

A 24 -year-old Spur trainee claims to have been fired for enquiring about his E368 salary which was not what he was promised when engaged by the eatery.

The trainee, Xolani Dlamini from Sicunusa, said Spur Manager Musa Manana fired him after working for only a month and four days as a chipper. Dlamini further claimed he has still not received his salary after his dismissal, which occurred on November 27. According to the trainee's contract of employment form that was made available to this newspaper, Xolani N Dlamini was hired by Table Mountain T/A Sibebe Rock Spur in October 27, as a waiter. He had to go through three months of training and was to receive a monthly income of E700 as per the signed contractual agreement for trainee. Dlamini said when he arrived to his place of employment being Sibebe Rock Spur at Mbabane Plaza, he was informed by Manager Musa Manana that he would work as a chipper instead of a waiter. "I was informed I will not be a waiter, instead I will be frying chips and onion rings and that was the first breach of contract as I was hired as a

waiter according to my contract," he said. Dlamini said he did what he was told and worked as a chipper from his date of employment until November 27, when he received his payslip informing him he would be paid E401 for the

whole month and a further E32 would be deducted from his salary, leaving him only with E368 for the whole month of working as a chipper.


"I was shocked when I received my payslip that indicated deductions of E12 for my graded tax and E20.65 as contribution at the Swazi National Provident Fund (SNPF). That left me with a net salary of only E368 after I had worked continuously for a whole month." Dlamini said he enquired from Manana as to why his salary had been cut and he responded that the company saw it fit to pay him that much. "I then stated that my contract stipulated I should be paid E700 as a trainee as I was hired as a waiter and had worked continuously for a whole month withmy salary calculated hourly."

Dlamini said after reminding his manager about the contract, he was told to vacate the Spur premises and never come back as his services were no longer needed.

Meanwhile, Sibebe Rock Spur Human Resource Manager Anita Belcher said they had 300 employees under their administration and had no idea about the case involving Dlamini. "We have no idea about Dlamini's case as we have 300 employees under our administration and if he alleges he was dismissed, we as a company follow procedure that is stipulated within the Employment Act. We do not just dismiss people without following the correct procedure," the HR said.

Belcher said for further queries on what happened, the manager that allegedly dismissed Dlamini, Manana, should be contacted.

Manana when contacted stated he did not dismiss Dlamini as he had no legal reason to do so, but there was a breakdown in communication.

"Dlamini came to me to inquire about his payslip then I tried to explain the deductions to him and the fact that we as a company have a cut off date. I told him he will receive his full trainee salary at the end of December instead of November," Manana said. He stated that Dlamini did not understand the reasoning behind the deductions and was then instructed to go to the Spur main office to process his enquiry.

"I referred Dlamini to our head office located before Queensgate where I thought he would receive assistance. Unfortunately Dlamini has not returned to work and we are still waiting for him as we are currently short staffed."

## GOVT EXPENDITURE STILL WORRIES TUCOSWA

THE Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) is worried about government's expenditure pattern.

TUCOSWA Secretary General Vincent Ncongwane said there were crucial matters that need to be put on the table for discussions by government, but they were not given a priority. He said instead taxpayers had been milked by useless committees some established through legal notices by the government.

The secretary general was addressing members of the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), Nhlangano branch during its annual day held at the Shiselweni Regional Education Offices (REO) conference hall.

During this event, the branch also recognised some of the teachers who had retired. This year's theme was: "Building a social conscience for our role as a teacher union."

Ncongwane was the guest speaker. He punched holes in the manner the country was governed and the poor management of the taxpayer's purse which is funding even expenditures that were benefiting no one other than the chosen few.

He came hard on the extravagant spending including the logic in the allocation of huge budget to the army as it was an entity that had nothing much to do other than only deployed to assist police.

However, when considering how it was catered for from the taxpayer's purse, one would think the army was assisting some of the war torn states such as the DRC or South Sudan. He said delaying to put in place a task team to tackle the issue of tertiary education's scholarship might result to chaos by tertiary students just like it happened in South Africa. Ncongwane said there was need to interrogate the issues of funding certain entities like the army instead of considering students for their tertiary education. He said funding of entities such as the army with

huge amounts was confusing. "It's roughly E30 000 per year for the enrolment of each tertiary student and for 10 students it amounts to E300 000. There is need to look if there is logic in allocation for the astronomical amounts allocated to the army and to establish what exactly it is used for. We cannot be funding at such

a huge cost an entity that fights no wars. They are not in the DRC, not in South Sudan nor are they in Aleppo which are known to be war torned countries," he said. Ncongwane said

were known programmes that govemment should fund instead of wasting money which was also not sufficient for the country.

He said the elderly social grants could be improved if government was considerate and cut on the other costs which were unnecessary.

"We can no longer afford to hide our heads in the sand and hope that the concerns about affordability of tertiary education will fall away," said Ncongwane.

Noongwane further raised concerns about the continued huge delegations that accompany the country's author-

Malaza is a teacher at Nhlangano Central High School. He said to be able to mount pressure on government, the leadership of SNAT also need to be kept on toes. "I urge teachers not to be afraid to point at our mistake, if we do not deliver as expected tell us. Keep the leadership on toes and by so doing the organisation will be vibrant and respected.

Let's start by addressing our shortcomings. If we do not have our house in order then let's forget that government will deliver to everyone's expectations. If it calls for you to stage a toyi-toyi for us failing to deliver, let it be so and we all should know that there is no way we can make government deliver when our own house is in tatters," said Malaza.





JOHANNESBURG - How South Africans reacted to the death of Cuban leader Fidel Castro can tell us a lot about each other's socialisation, world views and understanding of history and so help us understand each other's political instincts better.

The message is we are far apart, and that the divide runs largely along racial

Most black politicians and commentators praised Castro the last week as one of the world's greatest modern leaders, almost on a par with Nelson Mandela.

Most white politicians and commentators focused on Castro the dictator, the bully communist that had empoverished his country through oldstyle socialism, an international adventurer who played liberator to other nations while oppressing his own people.

Please note: I'm saying "most," not

What does this tell us about us as a people?

My first observation is that those who want to glorify Castro are prepared to ignore his dictatorial behaviour in Cuba itself because for more than four decades he had showed a fat middle finger to America and the West - and he was prepared to pay the price, or rather, he was prepared that his country pay the price for that defiance.

Castro is, in my view, correctly credited with helping force the South African apartheid regime's forces from Angola and speeding up the independence process in Namibia.

**Fighter** 

The Cuban forces' confrontation with the old SADF at Cuito Caunavale in 1987/1988 also undoubtedly contributed to a change in Pretoria's strategies and helped to force the regime to the negotiating table with the ANC.

That, and his solidarity with South American states in conflict with the US, established Castro's reputation as an unparalleled freedom fighter and champion of developing countries and the oppressed everywhere.

His fans paint him as a heroic David confronting an evil Goliath.

The mighty US tried its best, through a devastating blockade, countless assassination attempts and many dirty tricks, to force Cuba to toe the line, but Castro stood tall and defied them until the

What the Castro fan club doesn't end. want to talk about, is that he had banned want to take opposition parties, didn't allow a free opposition media or free speech and jailed many of his political opponents without trial and even had some of them killed.

In the eyes of his supporters, the fact that Cuba had the highest literacy rate in the world under Castro and free and quality health care for all counted a lot more than his serious human rights violations over a long period of time.

I made a television documentary on Cuba while Castro was still president. We tested these claims and found them to be correct.

We also found that most Cubans outside the small political elite were desperately poor.

The Castro government blamed this on the American blockade rather than the orthodox socialist policies.

What this tells me about South Africans who hero-worship Castro is that their anti-Western instincts are stronger than their pro-democratic instincts.

Economy

This has long been true of the ANC - an anti-West, pro-East bias has been part of the ANC's DNA since the 1960s. This phenomenon also explains the ANC's sympathies with brutal dictators like Robert Mugabe and Muammar Ghadaffi. Both became famous for cocking a public snook at Washington and Europe.

This primordial distrust of the West probably has its roots in the history of slavery and colonialism, especially the European colonial conquest of Africa.

The Cold War years when the Soviet Bloc supported the independence struggles in Africa, including that of the ANC, while the West molly-coddled the apartheid regime must also be a contributing factor.

It is clear that most white South Africans (most, not all) see the US and the West as the gold standard for democracy and freedom and leaders like Castro as little more than brutal dictators. Most Western nations are predominantly white.

Pride

Could this possibly be a factor? But there could be something else at play; something that struck me when I was working in Cuba: pride?

The people of Cuba - from the middle classes down to the poorest peasant - including even those very critical of Castro, were the proudest people I have ever come across.

Proud that the island nation never buckled under the pressure of the biggest superpower right across the sea from them; proud that it went its own way regardless of international isolation and economic ruin.

And that was mainly due to Fidel Castro.

Perhaps that is something black South Africans find very attractive. I certainly do.

South Africa's land reform programme, has suffered many failures and its beneficiaries have in many cases seen little or no improvements to their livelihoods.

Land reform remains a contested terrain or what land rights specialist Ruth Hall calls an "unresolved historical grievance". South Africa has a history of colonisation, racial domination and racially based land dispossession. Black people were forced off the land they owned and depended on for their livelihoods through numerous legislative policies and other coercive measures.

In 1994, South Africa's democratic government implemented land reform to rectify these past racial injustices, to correct skewed land ownership patterns and alleviate poverty.

#### **LEADERSHIP**

The land restitution process is part of the broader land reform programme which includes redistribution and tenure reform.

There is a general agreement that land reform has been a failure and needs to be sped up. Research shows that between 70 to 90 per cent of the projects (including land restitution projects) have failed.

Unfortunately, the public, ac mics, politicians and other stakeholders have largely focused on the land acquisition or restitution phases of the process, to the exclusion of land reform implementation and what happens afterwards.

The chorus for land acquisition has drowned out the plea by land beneficiaries for state support.

We studied the issue by focusing on a land restitution project in Macleantown, a village near East London in the Eastern Cape. Our qualitative research found that people living in the village had not benefited tangibly from having land returned to them as part of the restitution process.

#### WHAT'S GONE WRONG

Some research has been done on the impact of land reform. Most researchers have concluded that it has contributed little to helping beneficiaries earn a livelihood from the land.

#### REASONS

The reasons for this include inadequate post-settlement support, lack of skills, poor planning and infighting within communities.

Another contributing factor has been that post-restitution projects are designed in a way that favours

capital intensive commercial farming unsuitable to the beneficiaries's circumstances. The Institute for Poverty, Land and Agrarian Studies notes that: South African land reform beneficiaries have been victims of unworkable project designs, largely irrelevant to their livelihood possibilities, aspirations and abilities.

But the most common cause of needed to start ploughing. failure is a lack of support for farmonce they become landowners.

There are many examples of thriving agricultural entities becoming ghost farms after land reform. In some cases, farm infrastructure has been stolen and production has halt-

Our study showed that beneficiaries remain poor 17 years after being given their land back. Most are unable to generate a livelihood from agriculture and depend on state social grants for survival. Beneficiaries were able to rejoice at having their land back, but they have been unable to escape poverty.

One respondent said she could not farm because she did not have money to fence her yard or keep livestock. Farming would therefore be a waste of time as cattle would walk onto her land and eat her crops.

One emotional resident said:

"We don't get the necessary support from the government man! We don't get it, at all, they are not interested in coming to support us and help to give us something ... They should come here and make a workshop and call us together, those who are interested in farming and stuff like that, there would be a lot of people because I am not the only

one... They don't support us! They do give the land, and what's the reason of giving people land and then not helping them? Because we need a tractor, we need this and that, we need seeds.'

Apart from an absence of support, resettled people face other prob-

Water taps can run dry for days. The absence of a health clinic means they have to use the little money they have to get services from elsewhere. The mobile clinic only comes twice a month.

The local school is too small to cater for all the pupils, forcing some to travel vast distances at huge cost. And then there are the land invaders, leading to fierce competition for grazing land.

#### LOOKING AHEAD

The plight of the people of Macleantown highlights the need to revive the country's many failed land reform projects through postsettlement support strategies.

Giving people land and then depriving them of appropriate support to earn a living from the land is regressive. As much as land reform is justified, it is self-defeating for the government to dump people on land without sufficient or relevant support. The government needs to relook its policy of simply acquiring land for redistribution. It needs to take measures to make sure that redistributed land is used productively. If land reform is to continue in its current fashion, its prospects are doomed. It is the government's duty to see to it that they create selfsufficient farmers through the provision of post-settlement support.

## RNMENT CON E500M FROM R

**GOVERNMENT** has utilised about E500 million from the country's gross official reserves to finance budgetary obligations during the preceding month.

According to the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) monthly statistical release, gross official reserves amounted to E7.7 billion at the end of November 2016, lower than the E8.2 billion recorded at the end of October 2016.

'Gross official reserves fell by 5.4 per cent in November 2016 having grown by 12.8 per cent in October 2016," CBS reported.

"The drawdown in reserves was on account of the payment of government's budgetary obligations over the month ended November 2016," the CBS further stated.

The higher reserve position recorded in October was attributed to the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) receipts inflows at the beginning of the month.

In terms of import cover, the CBS said the reserves amounted to 3.7 months of goods and services at the end of November 2016, lower than the cover of 3.9 months recorded at the end of October 2016.

This is measured against the internationally acceptable level of three months.

"When compared with November 2015, gross official reserves were 14.1 per cent lower," said the report. Statement

During his annual monetary policy statement address 2016 in June, Governor Majozi Sithole said there was an urgent need for the country to broaden its revenue base to avoid a reoccurrence of the 2010/11 financial crisis where the country drew down its reserves to ameliorate the crisis to levels just above two months of import cover.

He said as a result the bank had to assure markets and the business community that the peg was safe; hence government has indicated that during the 2016/17, the priority would be to maintain the reserve position above the recommended three months of imports, "to shore up business and consumer confidence in the curren-

So far the country's reserves are still within the three months import

But, the short to medium term prospects for the country's reserves remains challenging as the SACU revenue has been anticipated to fall substantially in the coming years. However, government spending has been increasing

#### Review

During his recent mid-year budget review statement for 2016/2017, Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini revised the budget deficit upwards from E6.5 to E7.7 billion, mounting pressure on government to raise more money to finance its swelling expen-

In the meantime, total revenue collected amounted to approximately E7.2 billion as of end of September 2016, which was 54 per cent of the annual target of E13.4 billion.

The minister said it was imperative

for government to

consider cutting down expenditure to remain within the available resource envelope. He said this would avoid increasing the country's debt portfolio and also prevent accumulation of more commitments which might not be settled in the current fiscal year and would then have to be carried over into the coming fiscal year.

Meanwhile, the CBS reported that net government balances grew to E1.6 billion in October 2016, from E453.8 million in September 2016.

"The improvement in net government balances was reflected in a month-on-month growth in government's deposits held at the Central Bank which were boosted by the inflow of SACU receipts.

"The banking sector's claims on government fell by 2.3 per cent to close at E3.3 billion at the end of October 2016. When compared on an annual basis, net government balances with the banking sector contracted by 59.3 per cent," reads the report in part.

WITH less than two per cent of the Swazi population using commercial flights for travel, the Swaziland Civil Aviation Authority (SWACAA) has a challenge in attracting consumers to embrace this mode of travel.

Director General Solomon Dube, speaking at the authority's supervisory development programme in aviation graduation ceremony held at the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) last week, said they were busy looking at ways to

promote air travel in the country.

"One initiative the authority is exploring is the possibility of providing air travel for local tourism travel," he said.

Dube said the initiative would give Swazis a chance to travel around the country in one day.

"The added benefit would see the country from a bird's eye view. Few Swazis have had that chance and the authority is at an advanced stage in being able to offer this regularly to Swazis," he said.

Trade Fair (SITF) 2016 business seminars, SWACAA Director Air Transport Sifiso Mnisi said the local circumventing flight could also

be offered to school children as an annual trip. "We have often seen pupils undertaking school trips to places like Durban, Maputo and the like. This will help them to see the country from a totally different perspective, from above," he

Dube said it was important to introduce aviation to young children as it was this generation that could be groomed to embrace air travel as a mode of travel.

"What Swazis do not see is that aviation is a mode of travel just like taking a bus, taxi or private car. However, aviation is faster, which results in people getting to where they want quickly thus saving them time and money,"he



## SD needs to create at least 250 000 jobs - World Bank

THE country has a massive task to create at least 250 000 jobs in the long run, just to ensure the current employment rate remains the same.

A study conducted by the World Bank said the country currently suffers from a double digit unemployment rate and government therefore, needs to put in place policies that would create employment, especially for the youth.


"Half of the youth in Swaziland looking for employment cannot find jobs," stated the World Bank report.

The World Bank in the report, released this month said between now and 2050, Swaziland will experience a 43 per cent rise in the absolute size of the working age population.

"Creating jobs for all these new entrants will require strong policy efforts and large investments," the bank reported.

Adding, the bank said the worse challenge would be the creation of good jobs, which would give the next generation productive, fairly paid working lives that would allow them to save and invest, and bring on the benefits of both the demographic dividend.

"Swaziland's GDP per capita would almost triple if all policies went into



effect at once that would encourage job creation," the bank said.

The report titled, 'Forever Young, Social Policies for a Changing Population in Southern Africa,' illustrates how today's social and economic policies could be shaped to reap benefits presented by the region's changing population leading to wealthier and more productive future generations, fostering economic growth and equity.

World Bank Group Country Director for Southern Africa Guangzhe Chen said "Southern Africa has a chance to break intergenerational poverty by promoting social services that invest in the potential of its people from a very young age and by putting its highest number of people to work through harnessing its most valuable resource, having an increasing number of youth present in the next three decades."

"Our research shows that a growing, well-educated labour force that is supported by efficient services during all stages in life can set countries on an inclusive and sustained growth path during this window of demographic opportunity. But if policies fail to change, a poorly skilled and unemployed workforce will likely be left to perpetuate the vicious cycle of poverty and inequality," stated World Bank's Lucilla Bruni in the report.

### BUILDINGS WORTH OVER E91.1M APPROVED AT EZULWINI

EZULWINI Town Board has approved building plans worth over E91.1 million between April and November 2016.

According to the town board, it has approved over 30 building plans which included residential, industrial and commercial buildings.

"Although the municipality does not prescribe commencement dates for construction, all construction of approved buildings is expected to commence within 12 months from date of issue," said the town board.

The peak financial value of approved buildings was recorded in October, where projects worth over E58.7 million were approved by the town board. The second highest approvals were recorded in August, with seven residential and one commercial

building worth over E16.2 million. No buildings were approved in April and July.

The rest of the approvals were two residential buildings worth E1.3 million in May, nine residential properties worth E3.9 million in June and three residential buildings worth E6.3 million in September.

The town has invested in road infrastructure development to improve its ability to attract new investments while improving its asset value at the same time.

Recently, the Mbabane Municipal Council reported to have approved about 90 building plans worth over E144.3 million for the period between April 1 and September 30. Between April 1 and June 30, 95 building plans worth over E62.3 million were approved while the same number of building plans, but worth over E82 million were approved between July 1 and September 30.

## SRA TO ENSURE EFFECTIVE TARIFF QUOTA SYSTEM

THE Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) has been tasked to ensure that the tariff quota system is effective under the Southern African Development Community (SADC) European Union (EU) Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA).

The authority will further ensure that the country is ready to compile annual reports under the trade agreement.

Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade Acting Principal Secretary Albert Chibi, whose substantial position is director of the Investor Roadmap Unit (IRU) said these were part of the prerequisites to ensure maximum benefits from the EPA.

Chibi said government together with the SRA has already undertaken a number of stakeholder sensitisation workshops including government economists and the ministry of agriculture through assistance from the United Nations Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO).

"The EU has been very instrumental in assisting government with capacity building through regional development and international funds. "The Swazi economy is what it is today due to support from development partners like the EU. We hope the support that we have been getting all along will continue," he said.

He congratulated the SRA for working hard to improve the country's rankings in trading across borders.

"The country has continued to shine in 2016. It was ranked 30 out of 89 countries in the world. We are number one in Africa even in the latest rankings of the 2017 ease of doing business."

Chibi said in reaching the conclusion the World Bank looked at issues including complexity of compliance documents, clearance time and costs.

"The regional average cost in dollars is U\$950 and we are currently sitting at U\$135. Our maximum clearance time at the border is three hours against a regional average of about half a day or more," he said.

Chibi said although there were teething problems at first with the ASYCUDA system, it was now up and running.

The system was sponsored by EU, the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) Fund.


## SA TO IMPORT GM MAIZE FOR FIRST TIME FROM US

JOHANNESBURG - The government has approved imports of genetically modified maize from the US for the first time as the country seeks to bring in the grain after its worst drought since records began 104 years ago.

The country will allow the import of both white and yellow GM maize from the US, said Dirk Kok, a spokesperson for the secretariat of the Pretoriabased South African Cereals and Oilseeds and Trade Association, in an interview on Monday.

A call to the government's Department of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries outside of normal office hours was not answered. "The door is open to imports from the US" said Kok, whose organisation represents grain and oil seed traders.

South Africa has become a net importer of maize for the first time since 2008 after the drought slashed this year's harvest by about a quarter to 7.97 million tonnes, the smallest crop since 2006. That's pushed up prices on Johannesburg's South African Futures Exchange with white maize, used in South Africa to make the country's sta-



ple food of maize meal, surging 80% since the end of 2014 to R3 855 a metric tonnes.

Yellow maize, used for animal feed, has jumped 45% in the same period to R3 147 a ton. The decision "is critical," Wandile Sihlobo, the Head of Economic and Agribusiness intelligence at the Agricultural Business Chamber, said by phone from Pretoria.

"We are going to see a more strong correlation between the yellow maize price and the US price. The reaction of the South African farmers is going to be interesting."

By the end of April, South Africa may import 300 000 tonnes of GM white maize from the US and 500 000 tonnes of yellow maize, he said.

South Africa imported 555 241 tonnes of white maize between May 1 and November 25, or 65% of the imports forecast for the season ending April 30, according to the Agricultural Business Chamber. Almost all of that came from Mexico. Fin24

#### Rand stronger but rating agencies sound warnings in their reviews

JOHANNESBURG-The rand remained slightly stronger against the dollar, albeit off its best level, on Monday afternoon but was weaker against the pound and the euro, having earlier rallied on news that the three major rating agencies had resisted reducing the country's foreign ratings to subinvestment (junk) status.

At 3.29pm, the rand was at R13.8252 to the dollar from Friday's R13.8844. It was at R14.7899 to the euro from R14.7065 and R17.5885 to the pound from R17.5367.

The euro was at \$1.0698 from \$1.0631.

Rand Merchant Bank's John

Cairns said it seemed SA had been given some time to get its house in order. "To avoid an even more chaotic house, given that these results should see Minister Gordhan retain his position, even if the rumoured cabinet reshuffle does occur."

Focus

Europe would remain the global focus this week following the fallout from the failed Italian referendum, according to Cairns.

"Consensus expectations are for the European Central Bank to announce an extension of its quantitative easing money-printing/bondbuying programme for six months beyond the March end-date," he said. iNet Bridge

#### OUTA wants 'rushed, defective' energy plan trashed

CAPE TOWN - Civil rights group OUTA has written to Energy Minister Tina Joemat-Pettersson requesting her to withdraw the draft Integrated Resource Plan (IRP), it announced yesterday.

The civil body fears that, after six years of no energy plan update, the upcoming nuclear new build procurement programme is linked to the rushed approach.

"While the Department of Energy (DoE) have given notice of the presentations to the public at various locations throughout the country on their web site, starting on 7th December 2016, they have not advertised these sessions widely enough and as such, we do not believe this consultative and public engagement process is being conducted meaningfully," OUTA said in a statement

"The IRP is some six years late and now government appears to be rushing this process through without providing the public and civil society organisations with sufficient time to participate.

"OUTA believes the draft IRP has been reverse engineered to force nuclear into the energy mix and this in itself raises numerous questions about why the DoE is rushing this process.'

OUTA's energy team, headed by energy expert Ted Blom, identified several flaws in the IRP documents and methodology, it said.

OUTA believes if the IRP is signed off, a "process to hastily introduce nuclear energy generation as promoted by Eskom and the beneficiaries of state capture will certainly follow". Fin24

#### **FURTHER DROP** IN GDP GROWTH

CAPE TOWN - South Africa's gross domestic product grew at a meagre 0.2% in the third quarter of 2016, Statistics South Africa announced yesterday.

The growth recorded was significantly lower than the previous quarter's 3.3% and 0.1 percentage point lower than the 0.3% recorded in the third quarter of 2015.

"The main contributors to growth were the mining and quarrying sector, finance, real estate and business services and general gov-ernment services," Statistics SA Deputy Director General Joe de Beer said at a media briefing in Parliament.

The growth in the mining and quarrying sector, which expanded by 5.1%, was attributed to higher production in the mining of particularly iron ore.

Four industries - agriculture, forestry and fishing; manufacturing; electricity, gas and water; and trade, catering and accommodation - contracted. The agricultural, forestry and fisheries sector has been in decline for seven consecutive quarters.

"The contraction in the agricultural sector specifically could be attributed to the drought." De Beer said, "but indications are that the drought experienced in 2016 is less severe than in 2015." Expenditure on GDP grew by 0.5%. The increase was by and large as a result of expenditure in health services. which increased by 10%.

Government final consumption expenditure increased by 2.1%, with household consumption expanding by 2.6%.

Net exports in the third quarter contributed negatively to total expenditure on GDP falling by 26.4%, mainly because of lower exports of precious metals and transport equipment.

Imports also decreased by 4.9%, mainly because of subdued imports of machinery and electrical equipment. Fin24

NEW YORK - Hillary Clinton supporter Warren Buffett's Berkshire Hathaway could get a \$29bn (R399.32bn) boost to its book value under tax-rate cuts advocated by President-elect Donald Trump, according to

"We would view this magnitude of increase as favourable for Berkshire shares since it is generally valued on price to book value," Barclays analysts led by Jay Gelb said in a note to investors on Monday.

Berkshire has jumped about eight per cent in New York trading since Trump won the November 8 election, helped by the increasing value of Buffett's holdings in bank stocks as interest rates climbed.

The prospect of lower taxes is also helping. Gelb's analysis covered a net deferred tax liability of about \$50.4 billion at the end of 2015. a figure that includes

They argued that the candidature of the Zimbabwean strongman - who has ruled Zimbabwe since independence from Britain in 1980 - was a hard-sale to the country's electorate that is facing grinding poverty.

#### Worried

Zhuwao said he was worried that the lives of Zimbabweans would be at risk if Mnangag va was to become president of the southern African country. With a leader such as Mnangagwa, Zhuwao said he feared that most people in the country would be "wiped out".

"So when you threaten :ne, I will definitely look at at his (Mnangagwa's) envisaged government that if people oppose him he would kill them, and that to me is damaging.

People must be allowed to make choices without being intimidated with death or war, like what the so-called supporters of VP Mnangagwa are doing." AFP

#### Opposition leaders freed on bail

BANJUL — Gambian opposition leader Ousainou Darboe, who had been jailed for taking part in a protest, was freed on bail with 18 others on Monday, days after a shock opposition election win. The head of his defence team said the group's bail was a sign of The Gambia's new democratic maturity following its first transfer of power by the ballot box last week. Judges handed down the much-awaited ruling three days after an opposition coalition took a surprise victory u. a presidential election that will see businessman Adama Barrow take over from President Yahya Jammeh after 22 years in office. #### Forces say killed three in attack

BOSASSO - Soldiers allied to the Westernbacked Somali government killed three fighters loyal to the Islamic State in northern Somalia on Nionday as they pressed ahead toward the insurgents' main stronghold, officials said. The troops, alongside militia fighters, launched an offensive last week to wrest back control of the port town of Qandala in the semi-autonomous region of Puntland. The insurgents launched counterattacks away from their stronghold, in areas along the route to Qandala, and that led to the fighting on Monday in an area west of the port."Our forces attacked IS fighters in Obolohe valley today, killing three of their fighters and injuring two others," Mohamed Saiid, a Puntland military official involved in the operation, told Reuters. Reuters

#### Sudan court frees 26 fuel protesters

KHARTOUM - A Sudanese court has released

26 people who faced trial for allegedly protesting against a government decision to raise fuel prices last month, their lawyers said. The group, including 12 women, were detained after riot policemen swiftly dispersed small rallies that



were held against fuel subsidy cuts. All 26 had been charged with disturbing the peace."The court did not find any evidence against the 26 demonstrators,"lawyer Manal Khojli who defended some of the detainees told AFP."The demonstrators had protested peacefully. They did not disturb the peace and so the court released them."Another defence lawyer, Enaam Atiej, confirmed the ruling. AFP

#### Military chief-of-staff visits amid building

BEIJING - A senior Chinese officer has met Djibouti's military chief-of-staff in Beijing and thanked han for supporting China's construction of a military base in the Horn of Africa country, the second such high-level meeting in a month. Djibouti's position on the northwestern edge of the Indian Ocean has fuelled worries in India that it would become another of China's "string of pearls" of military alliances and assets ringing India, including Bangladesh, Myanmar and Sri Lanka. In February, China began construction of a logistics base in strategically located Djibouti that will resupply naval vessels taking part in peacekeeping and humanitarian missions off the coasts of Yemen and Somalia in particular. Reuters

#### 'Aid agencies overstating hunger'

ABUJA - Nigeria said on Monday aid agencies, including the United Nations, were exaggerating the levels of hunger in the strife-torn northeast to get more funding from international donors. In the last few months, Boko Haram insurgents, who have killed 1,900 people and displaced two million since 2019, have been driven back from an armittee size of Belgium, revealing thousands of proble that aid agencies say are near starvation. Problem Muhammadu Buhari's spokesman said "The problem Califus" were being made by, among officers, U.N. agencies about the region, where the United Nations says some 75 000 children are at misk of starving to death. AFP

#### Nigeria's Soyinka hits back at 'imbeciles' in green card row

LAGOS - Nobel prize-winning author Wole Soyinka hit back on Monday at critics from his native Nigeria, denouncing the "slugs, barbarians and imbeciles" who derided him for tearing up his US residency card after Donald Trump's election win.

"I don't want people we fought for to have the freedom of expression to use it for stupid comments", Woyinka told journalists in Lagos.

Soyinka, who regularly teaches at top US universities, made good on a pledge to bin his green card in the event of a Trump victory, in protest at the Republican's anti-immigration stance.

#### Reported

But after the news was reported last Friday, Nigerians fired up their Twitter feeds, simultaneously blaming the playwright and poet for his distance from his fellow countrymen, and demanding proof that he actually went through with it.

"I beg did you see him throw it away?" asked one Twitter writer, while another claimed: "(I won't believe it) 'til no video and no photo...."

"Why didn't he give it to me!" said yet another. Many commentators accused Soyinka of being disconnected from the plight of Nigeria's 180 million citizens, many of whom dream of the comforts of US life with its educational and economic opportunities, reliable electricity and freedoms.

Soyinka, one of Africa's most famous writers and rights activists, was jailed in 1967 for 22 months during Nigeria's civil war, or Biafra war. He won the Nobel prize in 1986.

UN mission in the DRC braces for clashes

NEW YORK – The United Nations mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo is bracing for violence ahead of the official end of President Joseph Kabila's term on December 20, amid moves to extend the leader's mandate.

In an address to the Security Council, which was holding talks on the country after at least 31 people died in weekend clashes, UN Special Representative to DR Congo Maman Sambo Sidikou spoke of a "sense of apprehension".

"Drawing lessons from the violent events of the 19th and 20th of September 2016, Monusco has further updated its contingency plans and is further adjusting its posture and deployment to mitigate politically driven violence and to protect civilians," he said, referring to the UN mission

In Kinshasa, Goma and Lubumbashi, Monusco (UN Organisation Stabilisation Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo) has deployed teams to track "human rights violations and restrictions of political space", the envoy said.

"These teams are designed to deploy into areas without a permanent Monusco presence but which are deemed at high risk of politically driven violence."

## FIRSTRAND CLOSED GUPTA ACCOUNTS ON MONEY-LAUNDERING FEARS'

JOHANNESBURG - South African lender FirstRand said on Monday suspicions of money-laundering lay behind its decision to cut ties with a business family linked to allegations of influence-peddling in President Jacob Zuma's government.

FirstRand, South Africa's biggest bank by market value, is the first lender to publicly disclose reasons for severing links earlier this year with Oakbay Investments, a company controlled by the Gupta brothers. The Gupta family, whose businesses range from media to mining, and Zuma have repeatedly denied wrongdoing. The Guptas' lawyer said on Monday suspicions of money-laundering were groundless.

#### Closed

In an affidavit seen by Reuters, dated November 29, FirstRand Chief Executive Johan Burger said his company had closed Oakbay bank accounts to comply with international regulations.

"These practices and standards require us to take steps to prevent FirstRand being used for money-laundering and other unlawful activities," Burger says in the court papers.

The Gupta family lawyer, Gert van der Merwe, told Reuters it took the accusations of money-laundering seriously and it would deal with them in its own court application, to be filed by the end of the year. "We want the real reasons for closing the accounts, not sweeping statements," Van der Merwe said

"They've not disclosed any real reasons to show my clients are politically

exposed people."

Between December 2015 and April this year, all four major banks, also including Standard Bank, Nedbank and Barclays Africa, terminated the accounts of companies controlled by the Gupta family without making their reasons public.

FirstRand's court filing is in support of October's application by Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan asking a court to declare he could not interfere with the decisions by the banks. Barclays and Nedbank said they would file legal applications similar to FirstRand's some time this week.

Last week Zuma sent back to parliament an Anti-Money-Laundering Bill that would have increased scrutiny of the bank accounts of "prominent individuals," including himself. He declined

to sign it into law, saying it might not be constitutional.

A report by the Public Protector, released on November 2, focused on allegations that businessmen Ajay, Atul and Rajesh Gupta had tried to influence the appointment of ministers. Zuma and the Gupta brothers have denied all the accusations.

The report called for a judicial inquiry to be set up by the president and for a judge to be appointed by the chief justice within 30 days of its release.

Zuma has described it as "unfair" and last week launched a court bid to have it set aside. On Monday the opposition Democratic Alliance asked the Constitutional Court to compel the leader to appoint a judicial inquiry as recommended by former Public Protector Thuli Madonsela. Reuters

JOHANNESBURG - President Jacob Zuma's office has vehemently denied holding back the release of the report into suspended National Police Commissioner Riah Phiyega's fitness to hold office. pointing fingers at the board of inquiry for the delay.

His office said Advocate Liza Tsatsi of the secretariat of the Claassen Board of Inquiry had indicated to the presidency on Sunday that the report was not ready as there were matters that needed to be finalised.

Zuma's spokesperson, Bongani Ngqulunga, when called to inquire about the progress of the report, said Tsatsi had stated "they still need to finalise it...She mentioned that one of the commissioners was also away and had not signed off the report, which must be signed by all commissioners. So, the delay is not on our side. We are ready."

This despite the board issuing a media statement, signed by Judge Neels Claassen, dated November 16. saying the report had been completed and that the "the said report will be handed over to (Zuma) on a date determined by (Zuma)".

But Ngqulunga on Monday said they were waiting for the board to indicate when they were ready so that Zuma could give them a date to submit the report. Claassen is assisted by Advocates Bernard Khuzwayo and Anusha Rawjee. The board was supposed to hand over the report to

#### SARS busts four drug mules with R6.8m drugs at OR Tambo

They also intercepted a box from India that contained 6.2kg of ephedrine worth R1.8-m during a random check at a mail distribution outlet - raising the total of the drug busts to over R6.8-million.

"In yesterday's incident, a Bolivian female passenger in transit to Maputo was found with a bag that a detector dog reacted positively to after X-ray scanners revealed four blocks of white powdery substance. These were confirmed to be cocaine weighing 9kg estimated at R2 589 000," SARS said on Monday.

It added that in an earlier incident on Friday. a South African airline female crew member was subjected to a physical search that revealed a body wrap underneath her uniform with cocaine weighing 6.585kg estimated at R1 894 504. 





PARIS - French Prime Minister Manuel Valls will announce next Monday he is running to become the Socialist presidential candidate in elections next year, sources close to him told AFP.

The prime minister's office announced only that he would make a statement at 6:30 pm (1730 GMT) from his political base in Evry, south of Paris.

But his entourage confirmed the 54-year-old Spanish-born premier would end the speculation over whether he would run - seen as highly likely following President Francois Hollande's announcement last week that he will not be a candidate. Valls was to have lunch with Hollande on Monday, as usual, ahead of his speech.

The French left, in search of a new leader after Hollande's exit, will hold a two-round primary in January to choose a presidential candidate.

The first round of the presidential election in France is due to be held on April 23 with a run-off on May 7. Polls show the far-right Marine Le Pen could triumph in the first round, but would likely lose to the rightwing candidate Francois Fillon in the run-off.

But with Sunday's Italian referendum defeat for Prime Minister Matteo Renzi just the latest rout of

mainstream political figures at the ballot box, no-one is ruling out a Le Pen victory. The divided French left currently appears ill-equipped for such a fight. Polls currently show Valls would win the leftwing primary but would trail behind Le Pen and Fillon in the first round of the presidential election.

Valls would face a fight for votes with two independent candidates who are not standing in the primary—business-friendly former economy minister Emmanuel Macron and the fiery hard-left Jean-Luc Melenchon.

If Valls does announce a run for the presidential office, he would have to resign as prime minister, sparking a government reshuffle.

## NORTH DAKOTA PIPELINE

CANNON BALL - Native Americans and their supporters expressed cautious optimism on Monday after the US Army nixed plans for a controversial oil pipeline crossing in North Dakota, with many fearing their victory could be short lived.

While the decision marks a win for the months-long protest movement that stood its ground even as the freezing winter set in, it could be undone when Donald Trump moves into the White House in January if his administration chooses to grant the pipeline the final permit it needs.

"There are still some remaining questions," said Dallas Goldtooth, one of the leaders of the protest camp in the North Dakota plains, where thousands have camped to block the planned route of the Dakota Access Pipeline.

"The biggest one of all is to see what a Trump administration will do," Goldtooth told AFP, calling the mood among Native Americans and the environmentalists backing their campaign "very, very cautious."

#### Concerned

The Standing Rock Sioux Tribe is concerned about potential water pollution and says the pipeline's route endangers areas with sacred historic artefacts.

But President-elect Trump's transition spokesman said the incoming administration was supportive of the 1 172-mile (1 886-kilometre) oil pipeline, which would snake through four US states.

"That's something we support construction of," communications director Jason Miller told reporters on Monday.

## US dad gets life in prison for leaving son to die in hot car

MIAMI - A man from the southin prison without possibility of parole on Monday for leaving his toddler son to die in a hot car while he sent sexually explicit messages from his office.



On the other hand, sponsors have been pouring in for the Gospel Awards as most recently Dem Dem Studios offered their premises for rehearsals to all performing artists on the night.


Dem Dem Studios is situated in Matsapha, Smitco Building and is under the directorship of Muzi Masina.

## ANTI-ARSENAL CLAUSE IN FIRMINO CONTRACT

LONDON - The contract of Liverpool forward Roberto Firmino carried a buyout of clause of £82m that can be triggered by any club except Arsenal.

In the latest batch of information released by Football Leaks, the details of Firmino's switch from TSG Hoffenheim in 2015 have been laid bare.

And according to a report published by Belgian publication Le Soir, the Merseyside outfit have taken measures to avoid a repeat of the situation that saw Arsenal make a bid of £40m £1 for Luis Suarez in 2013.

As such, "Arsenal can not buy him for (£83 million). Nor for any higher amount, moreover."



The Brazil international has made 13 appearances in the Premier League this season, contributing five goals and three assists.

Tottenham chairman Daniel Levy was also left scrambling to tie down defender, Toby Alderweireld to a new contract after the site revealed that the player had a buy-out clause of only £25m in his contract.

#### LEBRON JAMES STEERS CLEAR OF TRUMP HOTEL

LOS ANGELES – LeBron James is among a group of Cleveland Cavaliers players who have refused to stay in a hotel affiliated with President-elect Donald Trump when the NBA champions visit New York later this week, it was reported on Monday.

ESPN cited multiple team sources as saying that James, who endorsed Trump's rival Hillary Clinton during last month's election, would not stay with other team members at the Trump SoHo hotel in Manhattan for this week's game against the Knicks. The 46-storey luxury building, which opened in 2010, is branded with Trump's name through a licensing agreement. The Cavaliers have a contract to reside at the hotel when in New York. Last month, reports said three other NBA teams had opted to steer clear of Trump-branded hotels.

The Milwaukee Bucks, Memphis Grizzlies and Dallas Mavericks have all indicated they would stay elsewhere when travelling to New York to play the Knicks and Nets and Chicago to play the Bulls. Several NBA players and coaches have voiced dismay at Trump's election victory. Last month, Cavs reserve forward Richard Jefferson suggested that the team's trip to the White House to celebrate their NBA

#### CHAPECOENSE AWARDED COPA SUDAMERICANA TITLE

BRAZIL - The Brazilian club Chapecoense have been awarded the Copa Sudamericana title after the tragic air crash on November 28 took the lives of 19 players.

The South American Football Confederation took the decision to posthumously hand the award to the team who were due to face Atletico Nacional in the final.

Given that Capecoense now hold the title, the team will automatically qualify for next season's Copa Libertadores, the continent's top tournament.

This also means that Chapecoense will face Atletico Nacional - the defending Copa Libertadores champions - in an emotion-charged twogame series next year between the continent's two club champions.

Given that the majority of the Brazilian club's players lost their lives in the air disaster, the team are likely to field a team of borrowed players from other clubs.

Atletico Nacional wrote to the South American Football Confederation with their intention that the title be

handed to their opponents.

As a result, Atletico have been awarded the CONMEBOL award recognising an extraordinary contribution to fair play.

A statement from the confederation read: "For CONMEBOL, there is no greater example of the spirit of peace, understanding and fair play set forth as an objective of our Institution than the solidarity, consideration and respect exhibited by the National Athletic Club of Colombia."

The city of Chapeco is in mourning after the charter flight operated by LaMia was supposed to land in Medellin but crashed in Colombia shortly after 10pm local time, killing

71 of the 77 people on board.

Roughly 100 000 people gathered in the streets and Chapecoense's ground when the coffins of the players were carried into the stadium.

BERLIN - Borussia Dortmund can set a new Champions League goal record at Real Madrid today if the likes of Marco Reus, Ousmane Dembele or Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang score at the Bernabeu.

Dortmund arrive in Madrid just one shy of the 20-gc al record three teams - Manchester United, Real Madrid and Barcelona - have previously tallied in the Champions League group stages.

Two of those, United, in 1998/99, and Real, who achieved 'La Decima' - a tenth European crown - in 2013/14, went on to win that season's European title.

Thomas Tuchel's leaders Dortmund hold a two-point advantage over Real in Group F and the winner of tonight's clash in Madrid will qualify top of the table.

Star-studded Real, spearheaded by Cristiano Ronaldo, present a formidable challenge at home, but Dortmund are in buoyant mood.

It finished 2-2 when the teams met in Dortmund

last September as Andre Schuerrle's late goal rescued the hosts after Ronaldo and Raphael Varane scored for Real and Aubameyang had netted for Borussia. But Dortmund were boosted a fortnight ago by the return of Germany winger Marco Reus after six months out with the adductor injury that saw him miss Euro 2016.

The 27-year-old grabbed two goals, with a third later credited as an own goal, and set up two more when Dortmund trounced Legia Warsaw 8-4 at home a fortnight ago in a record score for a Champions League match.

Reus also weighed in with three assists, and had a goal disallowed, in Dortmund's 4-1 thrashing of Borussia Moenchengladbach on Saturday.

The injury, which meant a six-month break, has made him more mature," said Dortmund coach Thomas Tuchel.

"Now Marco is back and it's fantastic the way he has returned." Against Gladbach, Aubameyang

also netted twice - to make him the Bundesliga's top scorer with 15 goals – and Dembele also got on the scoresheet in what Tuchel described as a complete performance from us".

"In my opinion Ousmane Dembele had one of his best matches in a Dortmund shirt," added Tuchel. Reus is currently a joy to watch, from the way he casually robbed Gladbach defender Nico Elvedi of possession to his audacious backheel which set up Aubameyang for his second goal as Dortmund warmed up for Madrid.


