Over 60 cattle die at Mpisi Farm

ver 60 cattle at Mpisi Farm have died as a result of ingesting a consignment of poisonous bales of hay obtained at a farm from South Africa.

The number of cattle that will die as a result of the tarnished consignment is set to increase as the bales were bought by numerous farmers in the area and others from as far away as Nhlangano to feed their cattle.

Yesterday, on entering the fields of Mpisi Farm one was confronted with dead carcases all across the field. The ones that were still alive were found lying, some twitching as if trying to get up, most motionless with a blank stare looking straight ahead as if waiting to die.

Ministry of Agriculture Director of Veterinaryand LivestockServices Dr Xolani Dlamini said one of the symptoms of poison was that the cattle go blind before they die.

"The amount of cattle that have died stands at over 50 and we expect that more will die as there are other cattle that have possibly died in the forests nearby. Also there are farmers who have bought this poisonous consignment and it is highly likely that their cattle will die as well," he said.

Dlamini said the consignment was obtained from a supplier in South

used this particular farmer. This is the first time we have experienced problem," he said.

Dlamini said the consignment arrived on Wednesday and on Thursday the workers at the farm observed a number of the cattle exhibiting strange symptoms and then eventually dying.

"On Friday more cattle died; it was then that it was suspected that a particular batch of the bales of hay contained some sort of poison which was extremely dangerous to the livestock,"

Dlamini explained the biological

mechanism the poison it likely followed and the symptoms that come with it.

"It is more than likely that the poison sticks to the red blood cells resulting in the cell not being able to take up oxygen and deliver it to the rest of the body. Put simply, the cow is being suffocated and cannot breathe as a result of lack of oxygen because of the toxin," he said.

The director said signs that a show that a cow has been poisoned follow a pattern and farmers should be on the lookout for the signs.

"The cow first starts to stumble as if

it is drowsy and cannot stand up properly. The cow then starts showing signs of nervous system damage like continuous twitching, like a continuous kinking motion while it lays on the ground.

When the cow is immobile and is just twitching on the ground the cow's belly becomes large and bloated. After that it finally goes blind and dies. All this happens within a couple of hours," Dlamini explained. Dlamini was asked what farmers can do to help their cattle not die from the

"Farmers should pour about 350 millilitres of vinegar, half the 750 bottle, into a five litre container of water. After that add about forty spoons of sugar; mix the concoction until dissolved and then ensure the cow drinks at least two litres.

We first tried a couple of injection shots which proved unsuccessful however the vinegar concoction was found to be better," he said.

When asked why bales of hay were sourced from South Africa as opposed to locally, the director said, "there is very little supply in Swaziland as a result we have had to import from neighbouring South Africa."

With regards to the owner of the consignment that supplied the toxic batch the director said they had contacted him.

"He said he would be sending his own vet to assess the situation and based on what they will find they will map a way forward," he said.

During the interview a representative of the supplier arrived in the company of National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) personnel.

Unfortunately we were not allowed to listen in on their deliberations.

What we got though from the director post their meeting with the representative was that the owner was unable to come to the country to see for himself because he does not have a passport but will rely on the information supplied by his vets.

"He said he will take samples and get back to us as there is nothing that can be done but bury the dead cattle in a mass grave," Dlamini said.

When asked whether there would be any compensation to the affected farmers, the director looked at the ground, breathed a huge sigh and said, "that is not for me to say as it outside my ambit of expertise," he said.

"In this department I always feel that training for all officers should be the same. Even when it comes to the job the officers do, there should be no preference as all the officers possess enough capabilities. I trust all my drivers and I feel safe around them," he said

inister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Gideon Dlamini was vesterday fired, following months of investigation, also involved the Anti-Corruption Commission.

Dlamini has been pleading his innocence against allegations of impropriety that involved a donation of US Dollars 90 000 (about E1.2 million) from Qatar.

His dismissal was announced by the Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini. He has since been replaced by ex-Tourism and Environmental Affairs Minister Jabulani Mabuza.

The ex-minister first raised the public's eyebrows after snubbing public gatherings involving his ministry, instead, most of the times he was represented by Principal Secretary Jinnoh Nkambule and other ministers on bigger or national assignments.

He later told Members of Parliament during the tabling of the first quarter performance report that he was being probed for alleged fraud, hence he was advised by government to minimise his appearance on public events pending the investigations.

But he said his hands

were clean and promised the legislators he would come out clean and insisted he never even saw that money.

However, the Observer on Saturday has it in good authority that even before his dismissal, a warrant of his arrest had been sought by the ACC, but has been held in some offices where it was supposed to have been auctioned.

It is not yet known now that he has stripped off his cabinet position, whether or not the warrant would be served. His reasons for dismissal were not stated by the pre-

Nxumalo said he first thought it

was a prank but when he received more phone calls he started to believe the news.

"All we can say is Bayethe. For now we are just waiting to hear the news officially," said Nxumalo.

is Majesty King Mswati III has appointed Mafutseni Member of Parliament Christopher Gamedze and Manzini South MP Owen Nxumalo as ministers in a long anticipated cabinet reshuffle that saw two ministers reverting to their normal positions as backbenchers

Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Jabulani Mabuza has replaced fired Commerce, Industry and Trade minister Gideon Dlamini.

Mabuza has been serving as both minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs and acting Public Service minister for almost a year now since Magobetane Mamba took ill.

Announcing the reshuffle at Cabinet offices yesterday noon, was the Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini in a press conference held at Hospital Hill, Mbabane.

Gamedze has been appointed Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs while Nxumalo takes over as Minister of Public Service.

The prime minister congratulated the newly-appointed ministers and further thanked the King for the reshuffle. He said the ministers were constitutionally selected by the King from Parliament.

According to Section 67 (1) of the Constitution of Swaziland, the King can

appoint ministers from both chambers of Parliament on the recommendation of the prime minister.

"We hope as they enter Cabinet, they will work well with the other ministers," said Dlamini.

On another note, Dlamini thanked the contribution of the former ministers.

"We hope they would continue working for the country in their new capacities as Members of Parliament. After you exit as a minister, you enter into another phase of service and since both came from constituencies, they will serve in that capacity.'

Also present during the announcement were the affected ministries principal secretaries, Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade PS Jinnoh Nkambule, Tourism and Environmental Affairs Emmanuel Dlamini and Public Service Evart Madlopha. Others were Secretary to Cabinet Mbuso Dlamini and PS in the Prime Minister's Office Victor Nxumalo.

SIPA issues, first daunting task for new commerce minister

t seems the first daunting task for the incoming Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade, Jabulani Mabuza, is to deal with the Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority's (SIPA) issues.

Responding to a question asked by Observer on Saturday Editor Alec Lushaba, Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini said they were confident that Mabuza would resolve the impasse.

However, he said to date the issue has not been officially reported to

ministers or Cabinet.

Lushaba had asked the prime minister's stand following SIPA's Chief Executive Officer Phumelele Dlamini's alleged defiance to go on special leave as instructed by the board, pending investigations on complaints by managers and staff against her.

According to this newspaper's weekly publication, the CEO has 36 grievances against her which are reportedly still being investigated by the board. It was reported that the

board after engaging Dlamini last week, instructed her not to report to work on Monday.

However, she defied the board's instruction and it was reported that she allegedly boasted only the prime minister can remove her from office, because she was hired by him.

Responding to Lushaba, the prime minister said the corporate governance of parastatals differs slightly from that of public companies. because the CEO in parastatals is

not appointed by the board, but is approved by cabinet, and not by

"Most people when they think Cabinet, they think the prime minister," he said.

However, he said the issue has not reached Cabinet and has not yet been reported to ministers.

He hoped that the new minister would deal with the issue.

"We have confidence that Mabuza will resolve the issue," said the prime minister.

cow donated during the royal visit at the 2013/14 graduation ceremony, is at the centre of a controversy regarding control and safety from looting of farm produce of the department of agriculture in the Faculty of Applied Science (housing Home Economics and Agriculture) at Ngwane College.

Principal Dr. Amos Mhlalela is said to have announced that he was giving royalty nine cattle, five to His Majesty, three to Her Majesty together with one goat from the Mahlalela family.

He also is alleged to have announced he was personally pledging one beast to the King. However, on the day the cattle were to be transferred to the royal herd, they were now with the ninth not coming from the Mahlalela family as promised but taken from the college herd.

Insiders meeting in Nhlangano this week, including some former staffers who had already left the college, provided a list of anomalies in the manner the college was being run equating it to the running of George Orwell's Animal Farm.

Attempted

They alleged that they attempted to raise issues as they arose with the school administration but were treated with scom and in fear of retribution let things pass.

They revealed when they asked the person responsible for asset and stock register of the department of agriculture he could only say he was told by the principal that whatever

movement of things it was because they were towards purchasing of stock for the department of agriculture.

This goes for the fields in which the principal is alleged to be growing his crop for the upkeep of his family much to disgruntling by members of staff

"The situation with colleges is very unfortunate because, unlike schools, the parents are not involved, it is only the highest authorities with cronies at headquarters who call the shots, we the lecturers and workers have a limited voice.

We end up defending our employment," said the workers. They challenged Mahlalela to produce evidence on how he handled the transaction of the cow presented to the King in line with government accounting

procedures.

There are also allegations that Mahlalela is a close ally of a lawmaker who is influential in the running of the college especially in the intake of each year with some learners, even though they do not meet the required qualification before the admissions committee, end up in the electron.

This lawmaker is said to be pocketing something for his role in these transactions. The list of admissions approved by the committee and the one that comes afterwards are different and the entry requirements differ, naturally, and the committee is not allowed to question the vetting process by the administration without the admissions committee.

Called

Mahlalela was called on Thursday and the allegations put to him verbally and elaborated by way of a questionnaire, he promised to respond overnight because he was on a pressing errand to Manzini. Yesterday he said he was rushing to another errand.

"As I said yesterday that I was going out. I have now seen your questionnaire. I am going out for functions and I will respond to your questions. I will alert you when this is done."

He was alerted that by end of business the story would run with or without his comment.

Lecturers forced to alter students' marks

In a bid to boost the image of the college and for other purposes best known to the administration, lecturers allege they are made to alter the marks of poor performing students but when they refuse to do so they are served with letters of insubordination.

In these letters the nature of the insubordination, especially that they refused to alter the marks, is deliberately excluded to make it open ended.

Attempt

"In our attempt to resist this and try to be professional we are shoved these threatening letters."

They disclosed that they had attempted to reach higher authorities but failed because the targeted government official was said to be occupied with other more pressing state assignments, however, the attempt will be made with more vigour this time around including summoning external support. "Lecturers are treated worse than farmhands."

Principal is minister's homeboy, retirement shifted by three years

In ducation Minister Phineas

Magagula is accused of having been influential in the postponement of Principal Amos Mahlalela's retirement by three more years because he is his homebody from Lomahasha.

Notably the Chief Inspector of Tertiary Institutions Peterson Dlamini was retired recently even though he is five years younger than Mahlalela.

Raised

This has raised eyebrows among members of staff at Ngwane who label it blatant nepotism.

They allege they could not even challenge Principal Secretary Pat Muir because he is a beneficiary of the same corrupt arrangement having been recalled from retirement to load it on his subordinates for an extended period.

MALAMBE CHEWS E200 000 GOVT MONEY STAYING AT HOME

The promotion and transfer of one lecturer from William Pitcher Teacher's Training College, Malambe, to Ngwane when there was a more qualified lecturer to be recruited internally, sparked further controversies.

The qualified lecturer, Henry Ndlovu, was said not to have been in good books with Mahlalela as a result he, the boss, used his connections at the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) to fast-track the transfer of Malambe, a holder of an ordinary degree, to take the higher post which was to be occupied by Ndlovu who holds a Masters Degree. Ndlovu is reluctant to discuss his circum-

stances, referring all comments to the administration. He however insisted he never stopped working and to this day he is still the Maths lecturer. He did not deny the talk about his situation on campus but preferred not to mix in. Through this standoff, government continued to pay Malambe an estimated E200 000 while he stayed at home.

Government has made no efforts to recover this money. It was not until there was another opening for the transfer of Ndlovu that Malambe finally dusted his rusted gowns and began earning his salary through working after having stayed at home for almost an entire academic year, say staffers.

Outgoing students graduate without micro-teaching

ecturers say the indiscriminate admission of students without taking into account the staffing complement has resulted in poor products being churned out, the latest being the recently graduated who did not do micro-teaching.

They alleged that this year there are 250 students instead of a maximum of about

100 in the first year for the same number of lecturers but appeals to raise these concerns falls of deaf ears.

Another area of similar concern is the status of the ECCD, which stands for Early Childhood Care and Development (a programme that produces pre-school teachers offered at Ngwane College). The ECD section status remains unclear whether it is a private arrangement or a gov-

ernment initiated project.

Lecturers say the staff from ECD are paid for by government, use government time and resources but are treated as private employees of the owner's of the project.

To crown it all is those who graduated last year are wasting away at home because government has no provision for Grade Zero in its education system. This is the same with the Music department whose status is not clear as it would appear it is another private initiative yet funded by the state.

WHITHER THE CASE OF REGGIE

nother lecturer, Mduduzi Reggie Dlamini, was said to have left unceremoniously with suspicions that he may have been earning government money without proper resignation.

He was alleged to have applied for further education but his cheques continued coming to the school.

Dlamini denies he continued receiving cheques after he had retired, saying it was possibly because the school did not host him a farewell party as per tradition. However he suggested that all questions be directed to Mahlalela. Dlamini says even at the time of the back pay for civil servants, the famous dvuladvula, he had stopped getting paid and did not get it, saying he had already been replaced at Ngwane.

Eight Limkokwing Students suspended for inciting class boycott

he Limkokwing University of Creative Technology has suspended eight students for allegedly inciting others to engage in a class boycott.

This transpired yesterday at the High Court after the university filed an urgent application seeking an order to stop the students from entering the school and keep a 100 metre-distance from the school. The university instructed Musa M Sibandze attorneys in the matter and lawyer Banele Gamedze appeared in court. The High Court issued the interim order barring nine students from entering the premises and all others who engaged in the strike action. They were further barred from disrupting lectures and to keep a 100 metre distance from the university.

High Court orders them to keep 100 metres away from premises

Limkokwing University's Regional Vice Chancelloer, in an affidavit, claimed that following the class boycott that has lasted a week, the university engaged the Students Representative Council (SRC) comprising Baphatse Dladla, Siphiwe Fakudze, Elvis Mahlalela, Brian Sihlongonyane, Fikile Magongo and Sicelo Mabuza.

He claimed that the students had engaged in a boycott demanding the return of two employees whose contracts were not renewed when they lapsed.

He claimed that the engagement with the SRC seemed to have been fruitful and students were made to sign re-admisison forms to return to class. However, the SRC and other students, including Vincent Vilakati, Ncamiso

Nxumalo and Eric Zulu continued to block students at the gate preventing them from entering the premises. He claimed that some of the allegedly disruptive students entered classes and disturbed lectures.

He said the university had commenced disciplinary processes against some of the students who blocked those who wanted to resume classes.

However, he said the university feared that the students might continue to block their counterparts and intimidate them. He also said they feared that the students might continue to enter the premises and disrupt lectures.

"I submit that the university's academic staff has a right to execute their duties under a conducive environment. The actions

of the respondents are in direct violation, not only of the right of other students to education, but also they are endangering the lives and property of the university," Bell said.

He said the allegedly violent approach of the students made the university fear that its property might be damaged by the students in order to force others out of class.

The matter was heard by High court Judge Nkululeko Hlophe and the students were ordered to file papers to show cause why the orders should not be made final.

Environmental health officers storm ministry

bout 20 environmental health officers yesterday stormed the Ministry of Health building and danced in corridors to deliver a petition demanding a salary review and 25 percent overtime.

The environmental health officers from around the country had intended to deliver the petition to the Principal Secretary in the ministry, Dr Simon Zwane, but he was reportedly out.

They waited at the basement of the building that also houses the ministries of home affairs and that of Justice and constitutional affairs hoping to have someone address them. However, seeing that time was ticking without getting any audience, they walked into the building to the second floor where they danced next to the office of the Director of Health demanding that he accepts the petition.

Operations were momentarily disturbed as the officers danced, whistled and sang along the corri-

dors until the Deputy Director of Health Services Dr Velephi Okello emerged to address them. Secretary of the Swaziland Environmental Health Association (SEHA) Milton Lokothwayo handed over the petition to Okello.

He listed the grievances for the workers, which include shortage of resources namely staff and transport. He said the department was understaffed and officers were at

times forced to perform duties that were supposed to have been done by support staff. He said in many instances, the officers failed to attend to emergencies on time when they are engaged in national activities.

He also said there was shortage of transport and it hindered their operations. He said the department was allocated only one motor vehicle per region, yet they are supposed to work with and in the communities.

"Control of communicable diseases is being compromised thus resulting to quick and widespread of the diseases and more deaths. There will also be uninspected meat sold to the public because we don't have transport to inspect the meat before people sell it to the public, which may result in the outbreak of zoonotic diseases," Lokothwayo said.

He also raised a concern that the ministry failed to allocate accommodation to environmental health workers in all the health facilities in the country yet each facility needs to have at least two workers.

He said the workers demanded that houses should be availed to all workers to prevent instances where they are housed by community members in stick and mud houses.

The workers complained that they have been left out twice in salary reviews. Lokothwayo said in 2004 when government reviewed salaries, they were left out and when they appealed, they were promised that they would be attended to in the 2015 review exercise. However, he said, they were again left out.

"We feel that it is our right to be remunerated according to our duties and qualifications.

The environmental health assistants are graded in the A category (A), which is for the unskilled labour such as drivers," he said.

He also said the workers demanded government to give them a 25 percent of monthly salary overtime allowance across the board. He said senior officers had difficulty working overtime because government barred overtime payment for officers earning Grade C4 and above yet those are the supervisors who need to monitor the junior staff.

They gave government a 14 day ultimatum to have the concerns addressed, failing which they would withhold their services. Okello promised to hand over the document to the relevant authorities, before lapse of the 14 day peri-

SA company sues local Asian duo E100 000

wo Asian businesspeople operating a company in the country are being sued close to E100 000 for allegedly trying to defraud a South African company E6 million.

It has been claimed that Abdul Samad Essa and Abdul Latib Ahmed attempted to sell their shares held at a company, known as B & H Sugar based in Nhlangano to Sunshine Sugar Specialties, based in Johannesburg South Africa. It has been claimed that when they sold the shares to the South Africa based company they claimed that they had a sugar quota with the Swaziland Sugar Association, when such was not true.

The agreement, according to the particulars of claim filed by Rodrigues and Associates law firm, the agreement was entered into on January 12, 2016. The two agreed to sell their shareholding and all benefits, interests and rights attached to B & H Sugar for E6 million.

They claimed that they were duly authorized to sell their interests in B & H Sugar and all rights and benefits attached to it.

Warranties

Notwithstanding the warranties as aforesaid, the defendants did not have the authority to enter into the said agreement with plaintiff (Sunshine Sugar Specialties), to sell their respective interests in the said company without the express consent of a third party, Swaziland Sugar Association," read the court papers.

It was further claimed that the business people wrongfully and unlawfully did not disclose to Sunshine Sugar Specialties that they did not have consent from SSA to enter into the sale agreement.

As a consequence of their alleged nondisclosure of the said material facts, Sunshine Sugar Specialties was induced to enter into the sale agreement when had the material fact been disclosed, it would not have agreed to buy the shares.

It has been alleged that Sunshine Sugar Specialties cancelled the agreement, but had incurred E98 231.90 in respect of legal and professional fees, it was alleged.

The company is now seeking a High Court order directing Essa, Ahmed and B & H Sugar to pay the E98 231.90 with nine percent interest per annum. The matter is pending before the High Court.



She has all along relied on food handouts from the local community owing to the fact that the current drought situation did not give her a chance to at least cultivate her fields.

Ntshangase, on the other



Double payments not fault of Govt payroll system - Evert

Public Service Principal Secretary Evart Madlopha says the government payroll system could not be blamed for double payments because the system captures only one salary, calling this a specific issue that needs to be addressed outside the government payroll system.

He was responding to queries as to how it came about that Former Constitutional Review Commission Deputy Chairman, Supreme Court Judge Phesheya Dlamini and Suspended Franson Christian High School Principal, among others, continued to receive double pay and the anomaly captured by the Auditor General.

Madlopha admitted that there were, previously discrepancies with the government establishment and the payroll but that those issues were solved to a greater extent as there was now only one salary per public servant.

He could not elaborate on whether the cases of the three cited above had been solved and whether government had recovered its money, where due. "Under normal circumstances the system is perfect, there is no way it can issue two salaries to one person. I am unaware whether government has recovered monies from any such persons because that is outside my portfolio."

He further admitted that the system itself was fed and therefore any error could be on the part of the feeding hand.

However an expert in matters relating to the government payroll said it was important for Members of Parliament that once in govern-

ment payroll system a public servant was either active or inactive. This means the servant could be inactive and therefore not detected by the system until he/she becomes active again.

He suggested that the system needed to be checked on an annual basis for people to indicate whether they are still there or not in order for the system to decide on whether they are active or inactive. They must do this by way of filling in forms that must be fed to the system every after the end of each financial year. "The system is computerised with checks and bal-

ances and it has the capacity to detect inactive people. If people do not fill in the forms they will not be paid."

For about nine years now, suspended principal at Franson Christian High school has been drawing a salary without his matter brought to finality by the school administration, nor the Teaching Service Commission (TSC.

Calculations

According to calculations from the old government scale D5 which he was being paid under, he was drawing a salary of E239 819 per annum which effectively means that for the past nine years he has earned E2 158 371 while also making extra money as a lecturer.

Memory Ndwandwe, who was suspended for alleged maladministration, is now employed by one of the country's private institutions of higher learning AMADI University while also being paid by government. Chief Senzangakhona Phesheya Dlamini, now judge of the Supreme Court was still doubling-up as the country's High Commissioner in the Republic of South Africa.

Acting Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Pitso Msibi told the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) that until such time Dlamini got an opportunity to officially bid farewell to that country's president, he would remain high commissioner and was still entitled to claim foreign allowance.

However the PAC did not agree with Msibi, arguing that no person would be entitled to a foreign allowance while occupying an office locally.

The government official's argument was that they had difficulty denying the officer the foreign allowance yet, technically, he remained responsible for carrying out the envoy duties.

The PAC dismissed that either, saying there was no such technical-

ity that warranted payment of foreign allowances to a locally based officer. The discussion around the status of Dlamini's appointment was triggered by the ministry's failure to implement a resolution of the committee to recover funds that were paid to former ambassador to Malaysia Mphumelelo Hlophe. Hlophe was promoted to the position of principal secretary but continued to claim foreign allowance, He had so far not repaid the money that was unlawfully paid to him, resulting in a double benefit.

The PAC advised the ministry to seek legal advice from the attorney general on the matter, but warned them that there was no way a person could be paid benefits that legally accrued to him while he held a position he was no longer

occupying.

In 2012 the ministry of foreign affairs was advised to employ a private attorney to claim over E400 000 from Former Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Prince David. Prince David was paid E427 862 as foreign service allowances, despite that he had been recalled from Denmark where he was stationed and had been appointed Chairman of the Constitution Drafting Commission. Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Mpumelelo Hlophe, then said the ministry had tried to engage the services of the Attorney General's office, but he turned them down.

"The Attorney General said he had close relations with the former ambassador so he said he could not assist us to establish the court case." The PAC had said if the Attorney General was not willing to assist, then he should foot the bill for hiring private lawyers to handle the matter. Chairman Thuli Dladla was quoted saying the Attorney General should have simply recused himself and then engaged another lawyer from the AG's office. Hlophe said the ministry ran short of finances to hire a private law firm, which is why it had not resolved the issue to date.

Mugabe affirms Ezulwini consensus on UN Security Council

imbabwean President Robert Mugabe has affirmed the continent's stand on the United Nations (UN) Security Council where through the Ezulwini Consensus Africa wants two permanent seats in the body.

As reported in The Herald, President Mugabe's government has dismissed as shallow, attacks on him by opposition functionaries following his weekend address at the airport where he said Africa might consider pulling out of the United Nations if the continent is not accorded two permanent seats in the world body's Security Council. President Mugabe's Press George Charamba said the opposition exposed its little understanding of world affairs, adding that the position in question was a continental position adopted in Swaziland.

He said the agreement that was known as the Ezulwini Consensus

was not an invention by President Mugabe and, it was shocking that the opposition came to know of it through President Mugabe's weekend address.

"There has been a very shallow response from the opposition to the President's address at the airport," he is quoted as having said. "Firstly, the President was not developing a new idea. He was merely representing the position of Africa regarding changes we want to see happening in the Security Council. That position is now known as the Ezulwini Consensus. It was developed in Swaziland and we have spoken about it repeatedly. "It's a continental position and that is what is going to be Africa's negotiation with the rest of the world in respect of the Security Council reforms.

"The Indians have their position, the Japanese have their own position, Latin America has its own position — similarly Africa has its own position, and it so happens that the President who was coming from the General Assembly reiterated, not invented, reiterated the position of Africa."

Opposition

He continued: "Our well-educated opposition people who seem pathetically ignorant of world affairs, discovered Africa's position for the first time from the President's airport address. And they dare present their own pathetic views on the matter.

"It's not a domestic issue. It's a continental issue, and Africa has taken a position on the matter. The President was talking about his peers — Presidents of Africa not about puny little opposition people here. Little politicians here are not his interlocutors at that level. He is talking continental, he is talking

global. Before they open their mouths, they must just pass the test of relevance in terms of discourse."

Charamba said Africa's position was that the continent should get two seats with veto if veto was kept, or two seats without veto if the veto was abolished. "We are prepared to press very, very hard for that outcome and, 'we' mean Africa," he said.

"It does not mean Zimbabwe, except the fact that Zimbabwe is part of Africa. Really, the sub-text we are getting from the opposition is that they are the West's skippers. They dare argue for the West. They dare argue for the P5 (five permanent members of the UN Security Council), as if the P5 has no capacity to answer for itself and it's very much in character.

"They have never as opposition taken a national position let alone a continental one. They have always been pandering to a Western idea and they think the P5 needs their rescue. It doesn't."

SD LOSES E134M REVENUE AS UN REJECTS SALE OF RHINO HORN

enerating over E134 million into an rendowment fund to boost conservation funding in the country has been dealt a huge blow by the UN wildlife convention that has since turned down Swaziland's bid to legalise the sale of rhino

horn globally The sale of a 330kg stockpile of rhino horn to raise about E134 640 000 to be able to pay for wildlife protection in the country will for now remain a dream for the country's conservationists, Big Game Parks Swaziland. Parties to the UN Convention on

International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) this week voted overwhelmingly to protect rhinos by rejecting a proposal to legalise the rhino horn trade. The proposal submitted by Swaziland to legalise rhino horn trade was defeated by a vote of 100 to 26 with 17 abstentions. However, an expert from the United Kingdom, Keith Somervile feels the ban on rhino horn sales leaves open the question of

The country's official bid to CITES clearly stated that proceeds from the sale of stocks would have raised approximately US\$9.9 million (about E134 640 000) at a wholesale price of US\$30 000 (about E408 000) per kg. That would have been placed in an endowment fund to yield approximately US\$600 000 (about E8 160 000) annually.

conservation funding.

However, Keith Somerville, a visiting Professor from the University of Kent who received funding from the Comanis Foundation to undertake a research trip to South Africa and Swaziland to look into the issues surrounding the rhino horn trade proposals, said in his view the CITES outcome presents two challenges.

"The first is it remains unclear how the fight against poaching and rhino conservation can be financed sustainably without a legal trade. The second is that the ban on all trade has been in place for 39 years and has not led to an improvement in protection. Demand for rhino horn has continued to rise and prices have gone up. These have served to encourage poach. New methods are needed but there is little sign of any being developed," he opined.

"In addition, everyone agrees that conservation efforts need to be stepped up, and better surveillance introduced. But as Tom Milliken of the international trade monitoring group TRAFFIC asked after the vote: "Who will pay for it? In my view, NGOs wield disproportionate influence in the debate. They are a major source of funds for conservation and can use funding - or the denial of it - to persuade countries to adopt anti-trade policies. The effect of this is that states like Swaziland, Namibia, Zimbabwe and South Africa, which have the majority of the world's rhino and are struggling against a severe poaching epidemic that kills around 1250 rhinos across the continent every year, are left to pick up the bill," he assessed the situation.

poachers but have had little success in smashing the syndicates.

On a parting note, he states that the rejection of the Swazi bid will not end attempts to find solutions involving the reintroduction of legal and regulated trade, despite the emotively-expressed opposition of wildlife NGOs.

MADONSA RESIDENTS OFFERED SECOND CHANCE TO OWN FARM

Residents given option to make offer on land they occupy, Farm 319, owned by SNPF to avoid looming evictions

he 65 residents of Madonsa, who are facing eviction, have been offered a lifeline after being given a chance to own the land they are currently occupying.

This follows postponement of the matter between the Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) and the residents who are occupying Farm 319 at Madonsa, a matter that was before the Supreme Court on April 19, 2016.

The residents were given a chance to make an offer for the purchase of the property in question, which borders on the homesteads for the 65 residents.

According to the ministry of labour and social security first quarter perfomance report April to June 2016, in the previous quarter, the SNPF board sanctioned management to implement the court order for the eviction and demolishing of illegal structures on the portion of Farm 319. During the year under review, management, through the fund's attorneys, informed the residents about the board's decision and the demolishing was expected to be

carried out sometime in April 2016.

However, the affected residents with the support of the Swaziland Human Rights Commission and Public Administration (SHRCPA) made an urgent application to the High Court against the implementation of the eviction and demolishing order, where the matter was before the High Court and was later postponed pending the offer of the purchase of the property by the affected residents.

According to the commission, the eviction of residents and pending

demolition of their houses at
Madonsa is unconstitutional and it
does not matter whether or not the
imminent evictions are by lawful
order or not. Commissioner and
Chairman Sabelo Masuku, had
mentioned that no eviction had to be
undertaken without following the
dictates of Section 211 (3) of the
constitution. Visited by our news
desk this week, some of the affected
residents said the matter was being
handled by their lawyers adding all
they wanted was nothing but to
remain in occupation of the land in

question. The residents can heave a sigh of relief as the court also ordered the Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF), which owns the farm, not to take any steps to evict them pending finalisation of the matter.

The orders were issued after the parties reached an agreement.
According to the residents, the SNPF had resolved to stop the Madonsa Township demolition until April 1, 2016.

"In a letter from, SNPF's lawyers, Robinson Bertram, to our lawyer Vusi Gumedze from VZ Dlamini Attorneys dated December 15, 2015, we were informed that demolition was going to take place on January 11, 2016 and were advised to remove our belongings by this date.

However, we were relieved that an agreement was later reached in as far as the offer is concerned," said one of the residents who identified himself as Mamba. It was also agreed that in the event the offer was not submitted or no agreement was reached on the purchase price and how it was to be paid, any of the parties may set the matter down in court. The agreement between the parties was made an order of the court by a full bench of the High Court, which consisted of Judges Stanley Maphalala, Mumcy Dlamini and Mbutfo Mamba. The Swaziland Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration was ordered to facilitate the negotiations.

The homesteads in question are those built on Portion 1 of Farm 319 in Madonsa Township, just about 10 kilometres from the Manzini city centre.

The property in question is held under deed of transfer No. 575/1993.

The agreement by the parties comes after the residents filed an application in the High Court where they were, inter alia, seeking an order that the execution of the order granted by the High Court on August 9, 2007 authorising their eviction, be stayed pending the outcome of negotiations.

They also wanted the court to declare that the Memorandum of Understanding between them and SNPF constitute a compromise of the eviction and demolition order issued by the High Court on August 9, 2007.

Renowned




Swazis raised a lot of issues which were of concern, with most speakers touching on political ones, while others submitted issues touching on their personal lives.

A fortnight ago, management and other personalities from a local commercial broadcasting station were helping offload equipment to decorate the shop including an alter to give the office flair of the divine look. Although those present were not forthcoming with information, it was gathered that a wide range of artefacts will be distributed as magic charms ranging from amulets to ball point pens and the popular olive cooking oil, which is marketed as anointed.

However, there are fears this pastor could be selling the same disturbing claims as those made by another controversial Kenyan pastor of the same stock, Sham Hungwe of House of Grace International Church but would ensure academic success to the user regardless of whether they've studied or not. Although for

Magaya no distribution price list was offered, for Hungwe the pens were selling from 15 cents a pop, "but the more you pay for them, the better you will do! After all, the more you pay, the better your faith, and the better your faith the better the pens!" One woman paid US\$10, and was praised for her tremendous faith. Pastor Sham, and so much for his name is quoted saying: "It is anointed and I declare passes when your children sit for exams; when you sit for your exams and one parent explained their motivation for buying

a pen: "They (pens) are said to work for anyone who is sitting for any test. My son is not very bright and I think this will help him. With the knowledge he has acquired and this pen from the man of God, I think it is going to work." A member of the congregation testified that he scored well on national exams after buying a pen, triggering a stampede of interested buyers. Stories coming out of Zimbabwe about the said prophet paint a different picture when pitted against his claims to be a man of God.

PROPHET MAGAYA IN ANOTHER SEX SCANDAL, LOVER MYSTERIOUSLY DIES ON CHURCH BUSINESS

n October 13, 2014, the
Zimbabwe Mail reported that
the founder and Leader of
Prophetic Healing and Deliverance
(PHD) Prophet Walter Magaya, is in
the eye of a storm after being fingered in the mysterious death of his
alleged ex-mistress, Chipo
Chakanyuka (25) in Botswana last
month.

Fresh from allegations of bedding someone's wife – although the charges were later withdrawn from the courts – Magaya was now

embroiled in the mysterious death of Chakanyuka, a woman he, according to her parents, had an affair with between March and May 2014.

Chipo, who was head usher at PHD ministries, is believed to have "committed suicide" in a Botswana police cell under unclear circumstances after she was allegedly "found in possession of three pieces of gold" while on church business together with a fellow congregant.

Chakanyuka's aunt claimed in an interview at the family's Warren Park

residence that their daughter was "in a secret relationship" with Magaya between March and April although this was known to all family members, including Chipo's mother, Tambudzayi Chakanyuka.

Tambudzai confirmed knowledge of the affair saying her younger sister would give finer details. However, Magaya denied having an affair with Chipo let alone having a hand in her death and accused The Zimbabwe Mail of being used to tarnish his image.

Arrested for rape

n August 12, 2016 the leader of the Prophetic Healing and Deliverance Ministries (PHD), Walter Magaya, was arrested in the evening around 11pm facing rape allegations.

Magaya spent the night at Rhodesville Police Station, and he was released on US\$2 000 bail by a magistrate the following day. The controversial preacher appeared before Harare Magistrate Vakayi Chikwekwe just before lunch, and in addition to the US\$2 000 was ordered to surrender his passport, not to interfere with witnesses and report to Harare Central Police Station three times weekly as part of his bail conditions. He was not asked to plead. The State claimed sometime in June 2015, Magaya invited the 25-year-old complainant to a house in Mount Pleasant, Harare and allegedly showed her

around the place before leaving her alone in a room. A while later, it is alleged, Magaya returned to the room in the nude and raped her once, thereafter giving her US\$200. The prosecution says the woman told her lover about the alleged abuse in July 2016 and a police report was made. The State also claimed there were audio recordings of Magaya and the woman with issues surrounding the alleged rape. Magaya arrived at the court uncuffed in a double-cab vehicle and escorted by two police detectives. He chuckled as photojournalists captured him entering the building where some of his congregants knelt and greeted him as he walked into Court 6. Magaya is popular within the region and commands a huge following. He has toured South Africa and Botswana, where he has taken along a huge entourage of more than 15 buses and several escort cars.

Prophet Walter Magaya in big trouble

n February 15, 2015
The Standard reported that Prophetic Healing and Deliverance (PHD)
Ministries leader, Walter
Magaya was in trouble with Zimbabwe's largest Christian group, Vapositori, which had vowed to expose him as a magician and fake prophet.

As the fight between the two Christian denominations escalated last week, the Vapositori group said its members were challenging Magaya to an open spiritual power contest.

Apostolic Christian Council of Zimbabwe (ACCZ) President Archbishop Johannes Ndanga, said the fallout between his 700-member church grouping and Magaya now calls for an open contest to prove the source of power each of the denomination uses.

In the previous week, Vapositori said God had revealed to them that Magaya was not a man of God, but used artifacts including snakes as the source of his spiritual power to draw large crowds to his congregation.

They were responding to Magaya's claim in his book titled 'Marine Spirits, Mweya Yemumvura' in which he branded all white-garment churches, popularly known as Vapositori, as agents of evil marine spirits from the dark kingdom with a propensity to threaten congregants with death.


MANZINI CEMETERY NOW A STORAGE SITE, GRAZING LAND AND VAGABOND'S PARK

he total neglect of the Manzini Cemetery in Ngwane Park has attracted strong criticism from urban dwellers especially in the person of former Senator Mbhoshongwane 'Mbho' Shongwe.

Shongwe is a regular visitor to the cemetery to tend relatives' graves and attend funerals but has been shocked to realise that there, apart from complaints that there is shortage of space at the ratepayers' facility, are also no toilets while rather strange visitors, cattle, graze and destroy graves. On the other hand vagabonds have easy access and come to steal artefacts or memorabilia used to decorate tombs.

Drainage pipes have been piled at the cemetery for over a year now and Shongwe wonders why pipes should be stored at a cemetery. "A cemetery is supposed to be a quiet and peaceful place where we visit our loved ones who have moved on. We perform our respects and recitations or rituals in the quiet but we now have to share that space

with animals. We place certain objects of value on the tombs and these get stolen, where is the municipality?"

Shongwe says he approached engineers at the Municipal Council of Manzini and promised to fix the problem within two weeks but that period has elapsed and nothing has moved an inch. He has observed that cattle roam the graveyard and lean against the tombstones as they scratched themselves, (kutenwaya) because the cemetery is not fenced off. While cremation could be the

way to go, it is still not very popular among conservative Swazis with strong traditional values and beliefs in the ancestors and the rising up again some other time, that loved ones are not dead but taking a nap and still having influences on the life hereunder. Shongwe sees this as not an immediate and easily adaptable option but rather for the municipality to provide the service of maintaining a cemetery decent, clean and protected from unwanted visitors. Experts say there are alternatives to traditional cemeteries


that are likely to be compatible with traditional belief systems, and which would enable cities to address the cemetery crisis. One of these alternatives is the natural burial movement. Stuart Denoon-Stevens is a professional planner, a junior lecturer at the University of the Free State, and a researcher focusing on municipal land management, with a particular emphasis on pro-poor approaches, says the essence of this movement is to return the body of the deceased to the ground in as natural and environmentally sensitive way as possible. This includes being buried in biodegradable containers, and the markers of the grave being as sensitive to the landscape as possible, with many markers only being a tree, shrub or engraved flat indigenous stone.

"I believe that this idea can be taken further, and that land either used or set aside for recreational parks and as conservation areas could be hybridized into a joint park/eco-cemetery. This would allow municipalities to use existing land holdings without having to change the existing use of the site. It would also allow for us to remember the dead in a more joyful fashion. Instead of having to visit a stoic mono-functional graveyard, families could picnic and play under the trees of their parents, grandparents and even their great-grandparents. And as the children play they could be told stories of their departed elders, keeping alive the memory of dead family members." Another possibility is to use natural burial as a way to fund nature conservancies and nature reserves. Rights to be buried in these areas, and to access the gravesite, could be sold to families as a "graveyard servitude." In turn, the funds generated from this sale could be used to fund the nature conservation activities, resulting in a win-win situation for everyone: the municipality has one fewer graveyard to provide for, the family of the deceased have access to a more personal gravesite, and the conservancy obtains further funding for its nature conservation activities.

"It is time to move beyond seeing the issue of cemeteries as an issue of land shortage, to begin seeing them as opportunities to re-imagine bereavement and to return to an older, simpler and more beautiful way of remembering our lost loved ones."The municipality did not respond to our request for comment

URBAN TOILETS LOCKED AFTER HOURS, PUBLIC INCONVINIENCED

he locking of public toilets from the public at the end of business is another inconvenience to urban dwellers and visitors because they have no alternative places to relieve themselves after dark.

As a result, they make do with any space available and barely enough to contain their privacy just to relieve themselves. This has also angered Shongwe who feels the municipalities are short-changing the public because they do not provide alternative services. He was also reacting to media reports that people had been fined by the courts for urinating in public at the lower end of the Manzini bus rank adjacent to the flea market of 'bend 'n pick' fame where used clothing is sold every Wednesday and Thursday, the busiest days ever in the hub of Swaziland. "Municipalities are about providing the service and locking people

out of the service. Where are these people expected to relieve themselves when pressed if the toilets are closed? Maybe the people to be arrested are the municipality managers." Shongwe further decries the possibilities of spreading unknown diseases given that nowadays there are all sorts of ailments that have come about especially with integration and growing population movements. He notes that even if the municipali-

ties would blame it all on the shortage of water but there should be alternative relief, where is plan B, he asks? He notes that no one could possibly stop the pressure that come with one wanting to relieve themselves. "You cannot simply just stop it, it is natural." Shongwe feels there is too much swinging on chairs by managers instead of concentrating on the mandate of service delivery to the urban publics.

He suggests by this time, Manzini and Mbabane for instance would be having in place water harvesting strategies such as storing water in tanks to supply public toilets. "Now we are expecting God after having given us the rain now to provide catchment and storage tanks, that's asking too much from God.

We asked for the water and he responded by giving us the rain but all we do is create drainage systems to assist the water to flow steadily into the Indian Ocean where it can no longer be of any use to us."

Shongwe further notes that water ran out in Mbabane, the seat of government but still there is no plan of coming out of the situation he says it would be wanting of him to put trust to the government that has failed even in so basic a thing as this.



Gender based violence a huge challenge in the country

The Siphofaneni town in the past week came alive when the Royal Swaziland Police Service hosted a gender based violence campaign at the inkhundla centre.

The campaign, which was targeting the people of the Lubombo region, especially Siphofaneni, was aimed at sensitising members of the public about gender based violence as it was noted that the scourge was going up in the area.

Graced

The event, which was graced by Deputy Prime Minister Paul Dlamini, started off with a march at the centre of the small town and ended at the inkhundla centre where speeches were made.

The campaign was themed 'Let us join hands in fighting abuse and violence against women and children in our communities'. The different speakers on the day spoke strongly against the abuse of women and children, labelling it as barbaric.

Speaking at the event national commissioner's representative, Senior Deputy National Commissioner of Police Lydia Dlamini, said statistics showed that the Siphofaneni area and its

surroundings was a hotbed for gender based violence. Out of the 1 733 cases reported in the Lubombo region since the beginning of the year, 353 were from Siphofaneni, hence the rationale of having the campaign staged in that town.

"These statistics are sobering and a grave cause for concern, amplifying the urgent need for us as a nation to stand up and say 'enough is enough'.

"The phenomenon has also taken the dimension of being a crime of passion as the gender based assaults and homicides occur between spouses and/or lovers."

Dlamini said there was clearly, an urgent need to stop the tide by all stakeholders through increasing collaborative efforts and raising voices to be heard by all and sundry that women bashing is barbaric.

The senior national commissioner noted that the cases relating to gender based Violence in the country were on the rise as almost weekly, there were gruesome reports of incidents which occur involving mainly women victims who have been bashed, stabbed grievously or even killed mostly by male perpetrators.

"The UN appreciates the leadership of the Government of Swaziland, particularly the Royal Swaziland Police Service for convening all relevant stakeholders to come together to think, plan and act collectively to curb gender based violence in the country," she said.

Odede said though there has been successes in many aspects but the GBV statistics were very disturbing and what was more worrying was that the cases occurred within safe places. She also spoke strongly against the keeping of abuse a secret as most of the abuse go unreported.

"My appeal to everyone gathered here today is that it is upon all of us to turn the tide against GBV in our communities. It is upon all of us present here today to make a commitment to change the one in three statistic; to join efforts to make our homes and communities safe again for all who live in them," she

Abortion pills sold to school children in Manzini

n yet another abortion scandal, a foreign national masquerading as a businessman is allegedly selling abortion pills within the heart of the hub's kingdom.

Abortion remains illegal in the country, but pregnant women who want their pregnancies terminated have access to these pills through illegal


Investigations carried out by the Observer on Saturday uncovered that a tailor masquerading as a businessman, not only sells these pills to pregnant women, but to school going children as well, who in most cases want to terminate their pregnancies without the consent of their parents.

About a year ago, this publication reported about a doctor who only has South African contact numbers, and when contacted, one is further referred to local agents for termination of pregnancies at least according to an advert that had been strategically placed along the streets of the country's investment hub (Matsapha Industrial Sites).

Part of the advert read, 'abortion, safe and pain free,' also informed its clientele that after the abortion has been successfully performed, the cleaning of the womb would also be done and one could communicate with the doctor in question through the social network 'WhatsApp'.

It has been reliably gathered through impeccable sources that this particular businessman who poses as a tailor, has school going children as his target market. He would be called through his number obtained from one of his agents before one could make the purchase and get dosage instructions at his

place of business.

Approached this week at the strategically placed business area, one is scanned by some of those who seemed to be working closely with the abortion man since in most cases, purchase is made through an arrangement made by phone calls.

Information

The agents would thereafter engage you and find your needs and if not tailor related they would assist in anyway possible after having been informed that information had been obtained from other clients about their services.

One of our sources who confirmed having successfully terminated her pregnancy through these pills, said her concern was that her peers are in danger of losing their lives by illegally committing abortion through such.

This is more so because the person

selling the pills in neither a doctor nor chemist and has no qualifications or whatsoever in medicine but only has access to these pills.

This place is now known and people, especially my peers are using it, from my experience, I would advise that people should avoid pregnancies, or use morning after pills as opposed to such an illegal and life threatening means," she said. Of note is that the abortion house is located not far from a house of God where services are held almost on daily basis. Seemingly a number of abortion clinics have been advertising that they deliver abortion pills in the country, since some not only sell these pills but also performs surgical procedures with anyone willing to have an abortion parting with about E600 and it takes about 30 minutes to get the procedure done.

Public transport drivers, conductors dice with passengers' lives

Drivers let unlicensed conductors drive vehicles

embers of the public have reported local drivers and conductors to the Swaziland Commercial Amadoda Road Transport Association (SCAR-TA) for dicing with passenger's lives along the country's roads.

So serious is the matter that two lives were recently lost when a kombi driver let his conductor drive the vehicle while ferrying pupils from U- Tech School in Big Bend and the conductor lost control of the vehicle seriously injuring other pupils in the process.

Members of the public this week approached this publication raising concerns about the continued habit of drivers giving their conductors the wheel while unsuspecting members of the public are on-board.

Normally, the kombi would be driven by the conductor and while along the way to whatever destination, passengers would later realise that the kombi had in fact been driven by a conductor as the actual driver would

take over.

In most cases this is after their colleagues had flashed lights as they pass each other along the roads indicating that there is a police road block ahead.

"We are tired of this thing and I have since resorted to boarding buses as opposed to kombis since these people are really gambling with our lives," said one commuter who works within the capital city.

In an interview with SCARTA Secretary Ambrose Dlamini, he confirmed knowledge of the matter in question adding that it has been reported to their office Effecting.

"It is true we have received such a report that our drivers give conductors the kombis to drive yet they are not licensed to do so, we hire drivers to drive and conductors to collect money, we therefore condemn such an act, we are however dealing with the issue since it has been formally reported," Dlamini said.

He appealed to members of the public to assist them by reporting such cases each time they witness them happen since it is their lives that are put at risk.

Dlamini said passengers should not hesitate to call the police when such happens, and also made an appeal to the Royal Swaziland Police Service to assist them as an association in this regard.

He stated that the U- Tech incident was so unfortunate as lives were lost while others were injured in the accident.

Abortion remains illegal, perpetrators to fry, Police

cting Police Information and Communications Officer (PICO) Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said abortion remains illegal in Swaziland.

Vilakati said according to the country's laws, abortion is a criminal offence and anyone found to have committed same would be arrested and prosecuted before a court of law.

"We have had many

cases of women who have committed abortions and were arrested for such an offence and are serving their sentences, these apply to those running abortion surgeries or selling abortion pills, they will face the wrath of the law should they be found," she said.

She warned people against committing such an offence, saying the law would definitely take its course on perpetrators of such a crime. According to an abortion report about Swaziland, abortions are illegal in the country and have resulted in criminal convictions, but in October 2014 more than 1 000 women were treated for abortion-related complications at a single clinic in Manzini, the Family Life Association of Swaziland (FLAS), a family planning organisation.

In neighbouring South Africa, the legalisation of abortion in consent with strong family planning

efforts resulted in substantially fewer maternal deaths in a matter of a few years. Despite South Africa's proximity to Swaziland, travelling to the neighbouring state for terminations present extreme difficulties for Swazi women, as 70 percent of the population live in poverty. Travel and accommodation costs can prove insurmountable, although government clinics provide the procedure at no cost, at home ve tottl

Only high quality universities can build resilient economies

The idea of opening doors to more university students and availing more higher learning institutions was okay, because this is the direction that has been taken by most economies globally. But, there is more to it than just keeping up with the Joneses.


The term, 'massification' has been adopted to describe this phenomenon. Wits Business School, University of the Witwatersrand, Lecturer Sandile Sana and Faculty of Humanities, Emmanuel Ojo, described the term massification as 'rapidly increasing university enrolment rates.3

However, the authors stressed that a high-quality university education system must be realistic and appropriate to a nation's stage of economic, technological and industrial development.

With that said, it is clear that university education or tertiary education cannot be divorced from economic development.

Increase

While there is a risk of on oversupply of graduates, which might in the short term consequently results into an increase of graduate unemployment, this cannot be used as an excuse to halt massification. The country has this huge dream to pursue, so it needs skilled graduates, to meet this need, therefore, the country needs



enough universities, so as to open more doors for students.

But it should go beyond that, to proper policy, sustainable funding and planning. More so because, a high-quality university should not be simply a replication of what is happening in the Western world. I understand that, it must be grounded fully in addressing the local population's tangible needs before it chases the 'global prestige' status.

We need to take this right, while we work hard to put more students at universities that should not be done at the expense for quality. It is a sad fact this is the case; it is very unfortunate, because it is a

waste of a hardly earned resource, money and far-worse it compromises the future of our economy and our global competitiveness in the new economy.

Implications

It is surprising how we are prompt to comment on issues outside our borders, like the South African university strikes, its implications, how the students are so stupid, then turn a blind eye on what is happening right under our noses. Don't get me wrong, my beliefs are totally against strikes and I know for a fact that many times, most of the issues that students resolve to strike for, are either exaggerated or some individuals use them for their own hidden agendas, anyone who is honest enough and was once a student can testify to that.

It leaves questions why some other institutions are allowed to do as they please, compromise the quality of education and get away with it, with no one saying anything, not even Members of Parliament who are bothered by disposables, while all this happens at the expense of the country's economy.

It's like giving with one hand and taking with the other, then what's the use for giving after all?

That is why I never really understood why temporal teachers, who

never qualified to enrol at any tertiary institution, are granted permission to teach pupils. 80 percent of the teachers were temporary in my primary school and it has been counted amongst the worst perfoming primary schools in the country. Conditions

So, if it is true that at tertiary level, during this now matured era of globalisation and industrialisation, students are taught by noncompetitive lecturers in unsustainable employment conditions, then we can expect no miracle, but substandard products and non-global competitive individuals, in turn means weak institutions and low productivity and at the end moderate or sluggish growth.

What is happening at Limkokwing University of Creative Technology, mixed with the silence of relevant stakeholders should be a concern.

We can choose to turn a blind eye to these issues, but if we can get this right, the quality and competitiveness of our universities can improve and add value to industry and economic development.

Universities must first deliver the appropriate quality training that addresses the needs of the country, before chasing the global prestige



his week I came across some writings of one scholar Alice Bailey and it got me thinking and somehow scared about the future.

The future I am talking about is not a so distant one, but more of the present, which has not been fully unleashed to us yet, but signs are already all over.

Let me state that as a country we have already prepared the ground for it and our institutions are ready to defend this New World Order once unleashed.

The laws have been passed and there is very little we can now do. The roll-out for this programme is already in motion.

The starting premise for Bailey's strategy was this: Don't bother with the adults; target the children. If you can train the children, every generation that follows will be more receptive to "The Plan" than the previous generation.

At the centre of this new thinking or way of doing things is the removal of Christianity from our schools and society. What currently restrains this New Age at the moment is our political structure, which is seen at most to be clashing with the dictates of the new world order.

How? Some scholars have argued that Christianity has been at the centre of suppression and does not promote freedoms.

It is argued that it teaches citizens how to be subjects under a kingship rule. The whole Bible talks about Kingdom life, where citizens' rights are sacrificed to the will of the King. So for Swazis, the Christian faith teaches them how to live under the Kingdom and how to respect authority and the like.

It is then accepted that to deal with such a political set-up therefore is difficult hence the strategy has to shift to the next generation of leaders - the children. In Republics, it is easy to introduce these new thinking because, all it takes is a political group to come up and fight on the ticket to introduce those changes.

Money is available from powerful nations to support such leadership or people pushing that agenda. The first two points in this Master plan states the following:

PLAN 1: Take God out of **Institution of learning**

Removal of Christian Religious Education

(CRE) out of the syllabus; psychologically, in school, a child knows they are equipped to face life in future. Whatever is not included in the school syllabus is not essential. If you take it out of school curriculum, then you are inadvertently telling the children without really verbalising it that, "You don't need GOD in life. You can succeed without Him. He is an option and not a necessity".

. To replace CRE introduce many other faiths in the name of social education. Give them so many options, so many different faiths and philosophies. Tell them they don't need to make any decisions immediately but can do so when they over eighteen years.

PLAN 2: Diffuse religious radicalism especially Christianity

There are two parts to this strategy:

 Silence Christianity by removing it out of public life and education system, and be sympathetic to and promote many other faiths;

 After the other faiths have become strong, silence them, and create inter-faith harmony. Alice talked of a future where there will be a joining of faiths and we shall have interfaith movement. The children will accept all faiths are the same there are many paths to the same spiritual destination for all mankind. Everyone can take the one that suits them. All faiths are

equal and can move together without clashing with one another.

Then question I asked myself is given that we have willfully endorsed this new world order, how can we then salvage our identity and values?

The answer lies in the same tool they are using - education. In 2013 when this Parliament or Cabinet came into office there was a lot of talk about introducing Monarchial Democracy in the school syllabus.

I would argue that we now need to do even more than just focusing on Monarchial Democracy. We now have to breakdown Swazi Law and Custom, define who we are and how we get to function as a society.

It is clear that we need to strengthen the capacity organisations like Khulisa Umtfwana and reform our chiefs in order for them to be more relevant to the communities they lead.

One of the key pillars of a Swazi society is the strengthening of the family structure. If we allow the family structure to collapse, we should then brace ourselves for the crumbling of all our leadership institutions. The reason we have chiefdoms and the kingdom is because our family structures are sound and strong. It is this family system that has taught us to respect our elders, who act as our guide and counsel. Today, the new laws that are protecting children are saying we must not touch

them at all, but take a cue from them on what they want. They now tell us what they want and how they want it, failing which we are jail material.

When considering that we also have open borders that allows for the free entry of alien nationals, you can see that the Swazi culture is quickly being suffocated and soon much of what defines us as Swazis will be gone.

These foreign forces have systems in place to check and monitor the level of erosion by using the foreign press.

Recently, a London based newspaper, The Guardian, wrote a distorted account of Umhlanga. The slant of the story was such that those who attend Umhlanga are either forced by their parents who fear for their lives back in their communities or forced by hunger or poverty. It is not imagined that in this day and age, people can freely associate with a particular culture.

The truth of the matter is that government and some organisations are both guilty of accepting conditional aid without investigating how that would impact on the well being of the society. Some of the things I now observe as a threat to the way of life of the Swazi society were willingly accepted by us, without interrogating its consequences.

We all want the best for our children, but at what cost to nationhood?

Dealing with Diabetes

efore people develop type 2 diabetes, they almost always have "pre-diabetes" — blood glucose levels that are higher than normal but not yet high enough to be diagnosed as diabetes.

Doctors sometimes refer to pre-diabetes as impaired glucose tolerance (IGT) or impaired fasting glucose (IFG), depending on what test was used when it was detected. This condition puts you at a higher risk for developing type 2 diabetes and cardiovascular disease.

No clear symptoms

According to American Diabetes Association, There are no clear symptoms of pre-diabetes, so, you may have it and not know it.

Some people with pre-diabetes may have some of the symptoms of diabetes or even problems from diabetes already. You usually find out that you have pre-diabetes when being tested for diabetes.

If you have pre-diabetes, you should be checked for type2 diabetes every one to two years.

Preventing type 2 diabetes

You will not develop type2 diabetes automatically if you have pre-diabetes. For some people with pre-diabetes, early treatment can actually return blood glucose levels to the normal range.

If you have pre-diabetes, you are at high risk of developing type2 diabetes and also are at increased risk of developing heart disease. Pre-diabetes is a condition in which blood glucose levels are higher than normal, but not high enough to be classified as fullblown diabetes. Those with pre-diabetes are at increased risk of developing type2 diabetes within a decade unless they adopt a healthier lifestyle that includes weight loss and more physical activity.


First, let's define what "pre-diabetes" is and is not. Diabetes is defined as having fasting plasma blood glucose level of 126 mg/dl or greater on two separate occasions. If diabetes symptoms exist and you have a casual blood glucose taken at any time that is equal to or greater than 200 mg/dl, and a second test shows the same high blood glucose level, then you have diabetes.

In general, people who have a fasting plasma blood glucose in the 100-125 mg/dl range are defined as having impaired fasting glucose. If your doctor gives you an oral glucose tolerance test, and at two-hours your blood glucose is 140-199 mg/dl, you have "impaired glucose tolerance". Either of these is medical terminology for what your doctor is probably referring to when he says you have "pre-diabetes." Be sure to ask your doctor what your exact blood sugar test results are when he tells you that you have "pre-diabetes." Some physicians are not as familiar as they should be with the new national guidelines for diagnosing diabetes. They may be telling you that you have prediabetes, when in fact you have actual dia-

Among those who should be screened for pre-diabetes include overweight adults age 45 and older and those under age 45 who

are overweight and who have one or more of the following risk factors:

- Are habitually physically inactive
- Have previously been identified as having IFG (impaired fasting glucose) or IGT (impaired glucose tolerance)
- Have a family history of diabetes
- · Have had gestational diabetes or have given birth to a child weighing more than 9
- Have elevated blood pressure
- Have an HDL cholesterol level (the "good" cholesterol) of 35 mg/dl or lower and/or triglyceride level of 250 mg/dl or higher
- Have polycystic ovary syndrome
- Have a history of vascular disease

What should I eat?

It's not so much "what" you should eat. but how much. If you are overweight, your first and foremost goal should be to lose weight. This means working with a

Registered Dietitian to determine the quantity and type of food you should eat at each meal. One of the key issues in losing weight is controlling portion size. Your dietitian will also direct you how to make food choices that cut down on the amount of fat you eat because each gram of fat has significantly more calories in it than a gram of carbohydrate or protein. This means:

- Eating more foods that are boiled and fewer foods that are fried.
- Cutting back on the amount of butter you use in cooking.
- · Eating fish and chicken more, and only lean cuts of beef.
- · Eating more meatless meals, or re-orienting your meals so that your dinner plate has more vegetables, fruit and starches on it, and less meat.

Your dietitian will show you how you can continue to eat all the foods you love - just probably not in the same proportions as you have in the past. Having diabetes or having "pre-diabetes" does not mean that you can't



eat certain foods. The solution isn't "avoid foods with sugar in them." Rather, you need to lose weight if you are overweight, cut back on portion sizes, and plan for those occasions when you eat a small piece of cake or pie.

Physical Activity

Along with weight loss, your goal will be to begin program of physical activity, if you aren't getting regular exercise now. Why? Because physical activity will help you use the insulin you produce to convert the food you eat into energy. This will help keep your blood glucose lower. If you have a small piece of cake with a meal, follow it up with a brisk walk.






THE INCREDIBLY ARTISTIC MPENDULO

Painting is defined as an art and there have been many legendary painters like the famous Leonardo Da Vinci. Paintings (portraits as some call them) are impeccable art pieces where the artist expresses themselves as they feel.

They are respected and often expensive.

This young artist here, Mphendvulo Dhlamini, is no ordinary painter. He uses natural material to add effect on his art work.

Dhlamini is originally from Lundzi but was later adopted by a family form Masundvwini. He is the third born from 11 siblings and his grandfather is a senior Prince at the Lundzi Royal Kraal.

"Spending my life in an extended middle-class family in a farm contributed a lot in moulding my personality, hence I am a focused and disciplined cowboy. Furthermore, it contributed to my taste of things in life preferred music Country, Rock, Jazz, Soul, Pop and Blues. Growing up in an extended family is never comforting as one does not get the good things in life, especially the protection," Dhlamini opened up on his background. "I discovered my talent at an early age of eight when I used to have no one to play with than myself because they all resented me. My dad had a job in South Africa and visited us month end. My mother left us when we were very young. I do not know her by sight. I never experienced the love of a mother up until I met make Ntombie Mngomezulu whom I now recognise as my biological mom," he

This remarkable artist started working on his art at the age of 15 when he drew diagrams for his classmates.

"I used to make beautiful diagrams; especially for subjects like Biology, Physics and the likes, I made them at a fee at times," he said, chuckling.

After high school, he went professional and created a brand which he is still signed up under called DAWAD (Daniel Artworks and Designs) Studios. This company had been up and running since 2008.

According to Dhlamini, he also did cartoon sections for a local newspaper while trying to invest in his talent.

"I have now partnered with SM3 who also manage me. This company deal with banners, branding, graphic designing, business cards, car tints, signage and artist management," he explained.

Work done

Dhlamini was incorporated in last year's exhibit at the Lobamba Museum which was hosted by the Swaziland National Council of Arts and Culture. He has exhibited his material in most of Arts Awakes shows; this being a stable for talents.

"Recently, I exhibited my work at the Yebo Mzala Yebo Gogo Arts Festival and am yet to exhibit at the Lubombo Arts Festival which will be held on October 28. I have worked alongside big names like; Honest Mhlanga, Nil Mlotsa, Vusi Dlamini, Armstrong Mndzebele, Mbongeni Fakudze, Muzi Mkhwanazi and others.

"My material has been recognised by highly




influential persons in the country. It has been bought by Victor Gamedze, Sthofeni Ginindza, Muzi Dlamini, some Members of Parliament and the Swaziland National Council of Arts and Culture Council, amongst many others," he said.

Dhlamini uses twigs, pallets, grains from gum trees and river sand as a finish to his work. This is the reason why he can take more than a month creating one art work. He confesses that his work is







also inspired by great men like Steve Beko, Nelson Mandela, Mohamed Ali, King Sobhuza II and Gwamile.

'I do not refer to my paintings as paintings as I do not use paint only. In all these, I use natural material and preserve them with the special paint I use. I refer to my work as art pieces. I invented them and I thank nature for the creative mind I am acquiring," he said.

He encouraged those with talents not to hide them as these were not mistakes thus should be explored.


Floewe revealed to this publication prior to her performance that she had a surprise for her fans and it was a surprise indeed.

The Cuisine Corner

It is a soupy season as we regularly need to keep warm. Some opt for readymade soup while some prefer homemade soup. Here is a quick recipe for Sweet-potato and butternut squash soup lemon and garlic toast

Ingredients

FOR THE SOUP

- .500g and diced
- . 1 butternut squash, peeled, deseeded and
- 1 tbsp clear honey
- . 1 tbsp olive oil
- . 2 onions, roughly chopped
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed 1 vegetable or chicken stock
- . 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp grated nutmeg . 100ml double cream

FOR THE TOAST

- . 1 thsp olive oil
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- . 100g butter, at room temperature
- . Zest 1 lemon
- 2 tbsp snipped chives
- . 1 tbsp chopped thyme
- · 2 ciabatta loaves, cut into slices

- . Heat oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Put the sweet potato and butternut squash on a baking tray and add the honey and a drizzle of olive oil. Roast for 40-45 mins until soft and starting to caramelise at the edges, stirring occasionally.
- . Meanwhile, fry the onions in 1 tbsp olive oil until soft, then add the garlic, chicken stock, cin-

namon and nutmeg. Bring to the boil, and simmer for five minutes.

- Remove the sweet potatoes and butternut squash from the oven and add to the pan with the stock. Blend everything until smooth using a stick blender. Stir in most of the cream and bring back to a gentle simmer, and season with salt and pepper to taste.
- . To make the lemon and garlic toasts, gently warm the olive oil and garlic in a pan over a low heat for a few mins; the garlic should be softened but not browned. Remove from the heat and mix in the butter and lemon zest until smooth. Leave to cool, then stir in the chives
- . Toast the ciabatta slices, and top each with a spoonful of garlic butter. Serve with the soup, drizzled with the remaining cream, and some black pepper. (BBC Foods)

hen Annabel Crabb was collecting stories for her book The Wife Drought: Why women need wives and men need lives, I told her about a moment in my career when I had returned to work after parental leave.

It was six o'clock in the morning and an international teleconference that I was chairing was interrupted by my three children. They were devastated that their pet guinea pig had given birth during the night and that daddy guinea pig had proceeded to eat the babies, and chaos ensued. Throughout this episode, I continued to mute and unmute my line, trying to give the impression that nothing unusual was happening.

If this were to take place today, I would no longer pretend that all was well in the background.

Life is messy. If we want our best and brightest in the workforce, we need to accept that they have complex lives. We need to be flexible when it comes to the realities of balancing career

Being flexible at work doesn't just benefit people trying to balance their outside lives with work. An extensive body of research demonstrates the business benefits of flexible working. Yet despite this overwhelming evidence, access to flexible work and careers is not widespread. Flexible work is still regarded as an add-on, something we do for mothers for a few months when they are back from parental leave.

But in the face of rapid changes to the way we work, organisations need to move beyond just having policies for flexible working or making ad-hoc adjustments for certain individuals. Companies need to fundamentally rethink the way they design work and jobs.

The World Economic Forum predicts that we are on the cusp of a fourth industrial revolution. Technological, socioeconomic and demographic shifts are transforming the way we work, demanding flexibility in the way individuals, teams and organisations work.

At Diversity Council Australia, we all work flexibly. As a leader, thinking flexibly wasn't something that came naturally to me (at first). Yet by looking at our organisation as a whole from a flexible mindset, I could see the benefits.

We all have different things happening in our lives at different times. Not just caring for young kids, but other family members, community roles, study and volunteering. And all of these parts of our identities bring with them different skill sets.

oing business without proper accountability is like diving in a pool without water. At some point it could also mean being a 'stranger' in your own business.

Most small business owners tend to be reckless with issues of managing their own businesses especially with the most important resources of time and money. Most established organisations point out that accountability is one of the core businesses principles in the way they do their job. Organisations like Territorial-Landworks, Inc. (TLI) even point out that at the core of accountability is reliability and personal responsibility; therefore, we value the ability of our staff and organisation to honour our commitments. We will also take responsibility for our work and make what is wrong right to the greatest extent possi-

Accountability starts with small coins

Going by this notion, it can then be said that accountability is about demonstrating the ownership necessary for achieving desired results and it has become common practice for all members within the organisation to ask themselves what else can be done to rise above the circumstances and achieve the desired results.

Accountability involves a process of seeing it, owning it, solving it, and doing it, and requires a level of ownership that includes making, keeping, and answering for all commitments.

Even in religious circles, we hear of parables of the talents of which a master gives each of his servants some money to invest while he is gone away.

When he returns, he calls his workers and asks them to give an account about how they used the money. Those who were faithful were even rewarded for their efforts, but the one who was not faithful enough to invest the money was demoted and the summary of the story says that if one was not faithful in small things, then he or she would be not faithful in large things.

It ought to also mean that if one was not accountable enough in small beginnings, it would automatically be that he or she would not be accountable in bigger things

Creating a culture of accountability in business

Linda case, an industrial psychologist points out that accountability thrives in the right culture. Her thinking is centred on the notion of 'culture'. However, one would question as to what culture really means. Howard Culbertson from the Southern Africa Nazarene University argues that culture is what makes you a stranger when you are away from home. This definition of culture comes back to our discussion for today in the sense that one must not be a stranger in his or her own business. The notion behind this point is that when one fails to take the responsibility of being accountable for every action that took place in his or her own business that person can safely be termed as a stranger. This person cannot just give a proper report about the affairs of

his or her own business activities.

Bruce M. Tharp (2009) in his article titled Defining "Culture" and "Organisational Culture": from Anthropology to the Office argues that the culture of an organisation eminently influences its myriad decisions and actions.

A company's prevailing ideas, values, attitudes, and beliefs guide the way in which its employees think, feel, and actquite often unconsciously. Therefore, understanding culture is fundamental to the description and analysis of organisational phenomena. For some, culture is considered the "glue" that holds an organisation together and for others, the "compass" that provides direction.

High performance

Based on the understanding given by Howard Culbertson and Linda Case with regards to culture and business perfor-

mance, experts like Warren Tanner write on his internet block that make accountability a core part of your culture. This notion indicates that one must not think when to be and when not to be accountable when it comes to managing a business, rather it must just come automatically. The other point that can be driven from this idea is that there has been a general concept about accountable people being generally successful in life compared to those who were not at all.

The concept behind this notion is influenced with idea of high performance because there is a close relation between accountability and ownership. One would not call an accountable person if he or she did not have the ownership about the thing he or she was talking about. It is important therefore to state that with regards to managing a business ownership is about taking initiative and doing the right thing for the business. It's about taking responsibility for

results and not assuming it's not someone else's responsibility. At minimum, taking ownership means that if you recognise something is material to achieving results, that you take the initiative to bring it to the attention of the right people. If ownership is about taking initiative, accountability is about follow through and getting done what you said you'd get done. This then would mean that in as much as one would claim to own the business, he or she can also pass on to others the right culture that would establish the ownership of the respective business activity so that both the founder and the associate worker developed high sense of ownership. This would in turn bring about high performance in the affairs of the business

You know a man who after a few minutes after his pay touches his account, would dash off to the nearest bar and drink like there is no tomorrow regardless of the day of the week. Unelibhuku lomuntfu letjwaleni and before he pays or budgets for anything in his house and family he settles his beer bills. No sooner would he have paid for sitoko lasinatsa than he would attack the very same libhuku anatse futsi. Quite clearly ngumuntfu lohola kancane lo but he wastes his money on alcohol because he claims drinking makes him happy. The well paid are as much extravagant, nabo banawo emabhuku etjwala where they drink today entertaining masses and pay heftily in weeks to come. They do it in the name of fun, relaxation and networking.

Habit

At times they would even cite drinking on business. Now if nobody calls this gambling, I bet no one comprehends the meaning of the word and the effect of the habit. These guys get home drunk at least twice or three times a week someday *ungatsi* banatse tjwala bashaladi because wherever he enters kusala sihogo, an odour enough to suffocate luswane. Like in a Casino, you walk in with a fat wallet and come out empty, dejected and wobbling- the effects of the habit you have been indulged for a few, many hours previously, before one goes home.

Other than the traffic hazards of taking oneself to and from Mhlume, first sober, drinking along the way and back later and totally inebriated, there is a catalogue of accidents even fatalities, ever waiting to happen. An accident is imminent every mile, corner, camber, bend and stretch of the road. Drinking places are normally crowded and rowdy. There is very little space for fresh air and your husband may come back infected with tuberculosis.

LaMthiyane was persuaded by a strong cigarette odour to search all her husband's pockets thinking sewuyabhema. Nay, he had been in a bar where most patrons were smoking. Sengulolutsandvo lwabo lolungaka ke that they would share one begotten bottle of beer, each drinking from the same narrow opening. You don't know what infectious disease your drinking mate maybe suffering from. Isn't that gambling with your life all the 52 weeks of the year you are out drinking namaJimbos? In hush tomes, one cannot fail to bring forth that after drinking, sex becomes casual, free and plenty, anywhere, anyhow without, often times than not, the necessary protection. Violent

Kute kufa lokungabuyi ekhaya nababefrom his drinking sprees! Or he may not come himself, stabbed, smashed, slashed or fisted vele nje ulele esibhedlela. Drinking places can be so rowdy, violent and even

Thomas Hardy, that great English author of literature, had a character in the Mayor of Casterbridge, who after a heavy gambling and drinking sold his wife to strangers. No one could have done a better job than Hardy to bring a metaphorical semblance of drinking and gambling. Your drinking husband is gambling with you everyday. First your life; he will be bringing all sorts of contracted disease for your receipt and sufferance thereafter. However, an imbalance lies in that whilst he is away drinking, he spends very little time with you and his children. In

the interim, he creates a vacuum whereby, as his wife, ungagana and start seeing other men. Most women; wives today are greatly disturbed kubona babe angena endlini shortly after six on Friday or to be told by the children whilst she is still in town, "Sibasa ibraai stand nababe", or he is making fire in the lounge an indication kutsi akayi ndzawo. We share the same emotions of pain, frustration, fear, anger, and affection. Just because they don't speak our mother tongue and their faces have fewer muscles to define expressions, doesn't mean that dogs don't feel. It only means we don't understand

Chained dogs suffer unbearable misery. All dogs are descended from wolves with a territorial range of hundreds of kilometres. Their bodies are made for long distance movement; they are physically and mentally programmed for plenty of outdoor exercise.

Free movement is in their nature and chaining them is the utmost cruelty. When chained without shelter, water or food, or on too short a chain to sit and lie, it is barbaric

A chained dog cannot protect you or your property because intruders safely skirt the animal's chain length, or they attack the dog, which cannot escape but may choke to death trying.

Chaining is solitary confinement which, because dogs need frequent contact with their pack, ruins the dogs' nature as social


pack animals and creates behavioural problems. Chaining serves no purpose whatsoever except to cause the animal such torment that it does what we would do in similar circumstances - loses its mind. It becomes either apathetic or vicious.

An apathetic dog is no use to anyone. A vicious dog is worse because its aggression is random and it presents a terrible danger to children and other innocent people.

Chaining dogs creates unsafe neighbourhoods

Why chain a dog? To stop it roaming? Then feed it an adequate balanced diet so that it doesn't scavenge from hunger; sterilise it so it does not go looking for a mate; take it for a daily walk (or at least frequent walks) so it gets plenty of exercise; treat it as a member of the family. Dogs stay close to their pack.

If you need to restrict your dog's movement temporarily, put up a running line - a wire between two posts with the dog tied on a long leash to the running wire. It must have shelter from sun, wind and rain and a plentiful supply of fresh water 24 hours a day. It must be fed properly and receive plenty of loving attention from its owners as well as a daily walk to relieve its anxiety at being tied. A running line is a temporary fix.



Some American states have passed laws banning tethering of dogs altogether. Others regulate dog tethering as follows:-

- Tethering is temporary and never more than three hours at a time.
- The animal is continually in the owner's sight.
- The animal is not outside during extreme heat, cold or storms.
- The animal has access to food and water.
- The animal is at least six months old. The tether is connected to the animal by
- a leather or nylon collar or body harness.
- The tether is five times the animal's body length.

- The tether does not weigh more than one-eighth of the animal's weight.
- The tether is free of tangles.

If you want a guard dog, work with the dog's inherent nature: dogs are territorial pack animals that protect the pack and den. As a member of your human pack, the dog will protect your family and property. Some individuals and some breeds are better at this than others, but all dogs - large or small - have the same inherent nature. Your status as leader of the pack and your relationship with your dog will develop its protective instinct. Chaining does the opposite.

The question may linger in the mind of a consumer, what standards are, why they are of importance and how they benefit a consumer?

Simply defined, a standard is an agreed way of doing something. It could be about making a product, managing a process, delivering a service or supplying materials. Standards are designed for voluntary use. Standards can cover many activities undertaken by organisations and used by their customers.

Manufacturers, sellers, buyers and customers, trade associations, users and regulators contribute their expert knowledge in making standards bearing in mind the needs of the organizations they represent.

Standards neip support basic consumer rights, such as the right to safety and the right to be informed. They can be specific such as to a particular type of product or general such as management practices.

Standards also help support basic consumer protection enshrined in the United Nations Guidelines for Consumer Protection by helping to raise levels of quality, safety, reliability, efficiency and interchangeability. They can be effective tools in consumer protection as they can provide a basis for national legislation and certification schemes. They can also be regarded as best practice for use in promoting business and in litigation for damages.

HOW STANDARDS BENEFIT CONSUMERS



What consumers want in general are the best goods and services, for the best value and available to most people.

Products should meet consumer's expectations in terms of protection of safety and health, environmental protection, ease of use, quality and reliability, compatibility between products, transparency of product information and labeling, protection from false or misleading claims, fair competition, hence choice among goods and services and competitive pricing, systems of redress such as complaints handling and processing of claims, consistency in the delivery of services and suitability of products for vulnerable populations like children and persons with disabilities.

Guidance

Standards will also give guidance to the consumers on the labeling of food products. One important way of communication is product labeling, i.e. information that appears on the

product package or that accompanies it at the point of purchase.

Labelling enables consumers to make informed decisions and is intended for careful reading and understanding. It identifies the manufacturer and provides instructions for safe and effective use of the product, as well as providing information about contents, ingredients, health and safety features, preparation and storage.

Quality

For the benefit of consumers, organisations may use a quality management standard to help them work more efficiently and reduce product failures. A health and safety standard may be used to reduce accidents in the work place, an IT security standard to help keep sensitive information secure, a construction standard to help build a house, an energy management standard to help cut energy consumption, a food safety standard to help pre-

vent food from being contaminated and an interoperability standard to ensure that bank and credit cards fit into ATMs and can be used in the world over.

The point of a standard is to provide a reliable basis for people to share the same expectations about a product or service which then helps to facilitate trade and enhance consumer protection and confidence.

It is for these and many reasons why governments should adopt or encourage the adoption of appropriate measures including national or international standards, voluntary standards and the maintenance of safety records to ensure that products are safe for the intended or normally foreseeable use, all for the protection of the consumer.

Information from consumers and their involvement in quality issues contribute to the quality of products and services.

The role of consumers is to voice out their concerns about the products and services they are not satisfied with to ensure that those concerns are dealt with. It is important that consumers become proactive and inform the Swaziland Standards Authority (SWASA) through the Consumer and Public Interest Unit (CPIU) of any concerns as that provides a direction on what kinds of standards are needed to address problematic issues of products or services in the market.

inegar is a very sour liquid derived from fermented alcohol and has a very strong medicinal as well as preservative properties.

Apple cider vinegar, made from whole apples and not pasteurized or filtered, therefore it contains all nutrients in apples plus many enzymes and organic acids produced during the fermentation needed to make the

Apple cider vinegar especially when used correctly could do the body a lot of good. Vinegar helps the body to stabilize its calcium levels and in this way it could help to strengthen the skeleton and minimise as well as fight osteoporosis and even strengthen hair, teeth and nails in the process. Vinegar is an antiseptic and works wonders for kidney and bladder infections. Vinegar is an anti-bacterial and balances just about all your metabolic functions. It also fights fungi in especially the excretory organs.

Apple cider vinegar is an excellent tonic: gargle with it for a sore throat and see what happens. Half a teaspoon of apple cider vinegar in a glass of water first thing in the morning and just before meals will definitely dampen your appetite, stimulate and promote your digestive processes and in doing so help you to lose weight. To clear bronchitis, pour apple cider vinegar in a bowl of boiling hot water cover your head with a towel and breathe in the steam. If you want to have a good night rest mix a tablespoon of apple cider vinegar with honey in a glass of warm water before retiring.

Vinegar and honey in warm water helps with digestive problems and bladder infections. Apple cider vinegar on a bee sting or a bug bite will make the swelling go down and take away the sting. Asthmatic problems constant coughing and bronchitis take flight when confronted with a mix of two tablespoons of vinegar and honey in a cup of warm water. It also helps for arthritis try it and see what happens. Regular apple cider vinegar on athlete's foot and ringworm, vinegar mixed with warm water helps for vaginal itchiness applied externally. Pour a cup of vinegar in the bath water for a good detox and skin cleanse. Vinegar can assist in strong healthy hair and nail growth.

Take a teaspoonful of apple cider vinegar; its sour taste could stop a hiccup in its tracks. A scientist took the hiccup remedy further and created a lollipop that includes apple cider vinegar, which she says "cancels out the message to hiccup" by over stimulating the nerves in the throat responsible for the spasms. Exercise and sometimes extreme stress cause lactic acid to build up in the body, causing fatigue. Interestingly, the amino acids contained in apple cider vinegar act as an antidote. Apple cider vinegar contains potassium and enzymes that may relieve that tired feeling. Add a tablespoon or two of apple cider vinegar to a glass of chilled vegetable drink or to a glass of water to boost your energy. Apple cider vinegar could help keep your blood sugar levels balanced, according to several studies that have shown a link between the two. One study of people with type 2 diabetes who were not taking insulin found that taking two tablespoons of apple cider vinegar before bed resulted in lower glucose levels by morning.

(ACETIC ACID)



Another study found that insulin resistant people who drank a mixture of apple cider vinegar and water before eating a high carbohydrate meal had lower blood sugar afterward. Scientists think the antiglycemic effect of the acid is the key.

How does apple cider vinegar help you improve your health and well-being?

Since apple cider vinegar is made of apples, it contains the nutrients that are present in apples contains many vitamins, minerals, antioxidants, and dietary fiber, while at the same time having very little fat and sodium. Apple cider vinegar, made from whole apples and not pasteurized or filtered, will also contain all these nutrients plus the many enzymes and organic acids produced during the two fermentations needed to make the vinegar.

Organic acids

Apple cider vinegar contains five percent acetic acid and much smaller amounts of malic acid, lactic acid, and various amino acids. They give apple cider vinegar its antiseptic property, which helps deter the growth of unwanted bacteria and yeasts in the digestive track. By taking a little apple cider vinegar before a meal, you can increase stomach acidity and thereby improve digestion and nutrient uptake.

Vitamins and other antioxidants

Some of the vitamins, amino acids, and bioflavonoids found in apples and apple cider vinegar are antioxidants, which help prevent cancer and protect the body against damage caused by exposure to chemical tox-

Fibre

Apples and apple cider vinegar contain pectin, a water soluble fibre which can absorb water, fat, toxins, and cholesterol in the digestive tract and remove them from the body. Pectin also improves glucose metabolism and lowers blood pressure resulting in

improved heart health. The insoluble fibre in apples aids digestion and elimination, promotes regularity, and contributes to bowel cleaning.

Mineral

Apple cider vinegar has a host of easily absorbable minerals, with potassium being by far the most plentiful. Potassium works together with sodium in the control of the body's water balance, conduction of nerve impulses, contraction of muscles, maintenance of a normal heart rhythm, and it is essential for the storage of carbohydrate and its breakdown for energy. Magnesium, a mineral found in smaller amounts, is a vital catalyst in enzyme activity, involved in the production of energy from food. It assists in the uptake of calcium and potassium and is required for the formation of healthy bones and teeth.

Ways to add apple cider vinegar to your diet

- 1. Drizzle a teaspoon on top of your salad or mix it with your favourite salad dressing.
- 2. Dip your French fries in vinegar especially on sweet potato fries!
- 3. Add apple cider vinegar to mayonnaisebased or other vinaigrette-based salads like coleslaw.
- 4. Use as a marinade for meat, chicken, and vegetables. A vinegar marinade works well mixed with equal parts of olive oil.
- 5. Try a delicious mixture of 1 tablespoon of apple cider and 1/4 teaspoon of balsamic vinegar poured over grilled or roasted vegetables. This also works well poured over sautéed vegetables.
- 6. Glaze salmon in the broiler with a combination of apple cider vinegar mixed with honey. After baking is almost done, remove salmon, brush with the glaze. Return to the oven and broil fish until top looks bubbly.
- 7. If you love popcorn and want a low calorie substitute for butter, fill a spray bottle with apple cider vinegar and finely spray the popcorn and top with a little salt or pepper.
- 8. You can easily add one tablespoon of vinegar to any smoothie, but this one works

well! Start by putting 1/2 tablespoon of vinegar into the blender, add a whole banana, five chopped strawberries, one tablespoon of honey, one cup of apple or orange juice, and blend until smooth.

- 9. Startyour morning with a glass of water mixed with a teaspoon of apple cider vinegar and little honey. You can also add the vinegar to any juice.
- 10. Add some zest to a large can of baked beans by adding a tablespoon of apple cider
- 11. Rinse your fruits and vegetables with vinegar. This adds some vinegar to your diet and also removes harmful bacteria and pesti-
- 12.If you require lemon for some preparation, but find that you are out of it, just now. you can substitute it with apple cider vinegar. This fantastic product not only brings that tangy taste you require, but also adds its unique flavour to any recipe you prepare.

Easy recipes to include apple cider vinegar in your diet

The sour taste of vinegar makes it hard to drink it on its own yet it is full of nutrients and has a number of health benefits. These recipes will ensure that apple cider vinegar is incorporated into your diet.

Pink super juice

- One 1/2 C Fresh grapefruit juice

Cider Vinegar Chicken Ingredients

- Six skinless, boneless chicken breasts
- Five tablespoons garlic salt
- One cup cider vinegar

Method

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Place chicken breasts in a 9x13 inch baking dish. Sprinkle with garlic salt, then pour vinegar over all.
- Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 35 minutes or until chicken is browned and cooked through, and juices run clear.

Green Beans with Cider Glaze Ingredients

- One pound green beans fresh
- One red onion medium, sliced length-
- Two tablespoons butter
- Three tablespoons apple cider vinegar
- One teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon hot chili peppers freshly ground
- Two teaspoons dijon mustard

Method

- Cook beans in boiling water until crisptender, five minutes; drain.
- Cook Onions in butter in a large pot over medium heat for two minutes.
- Add apple cider vinegar and cook until almost all the liquid is gone, seven minutes.
- Stir in salt, pepper, and mustard; add beans and stir until heated through.
- Everything has its pros and cons therefore it is important to seek medical advice before using apple cider vinegar especially if you are suffering from sugar diabetes or heart diseases. ensions are rising as the race for a new United Nations (UN) secretary-general, to replace the outgoing Ban Ki-moon, enters a decisive phase. A crucial voting session was scheduled for Wednesday this past week in New York.

Bulgaria also entered a surprise last-minute candidate, hoping that she would increase the country's chances to clinch the position.

Wednesday's secret straw poll, which is nonbinding, will be the first in which the five permanent members of the UN Security Council (UNSC) are allowed to indicate a veto for one of the candidates through colour-coded ballots. The previous five straw polls were undifferentiated they only indicated whether members 'encourage' or 'discourage' a candidate, and there was no difference in votes by permanent or non-permanent members. These are, however, still preliminary votes before a final voting session takes place. In the current polarised climate, with the United States (US) and Russia facing off over the war in Syria, the election could be another occasion for a show of force between the world's big powers. If this happens and the final lap becomes a tit-for-tat exchange between the veto-wielding members, it will deal a heavy blow to an organisation already suffering from a lack of credibility due to the delay in reforming the UN Security Council (UNSC).

For now, former Portuguese Prime Minister António Guterres, who has just finished 10 years as head of the UN High Commission for Refugees, is the clear frontrunner. Yet he doesn't meet the two criteria that many nations want to see fulfilled: he is not from Eastern Europe, and he isn't a woman.

There has never been UN secretary-general from Eastern Europe. Although there is not a written rule, many members – Russia especially – believe the region is now owed a turn. In the last poll on 26 September, the former Serbian Foreign Minister, Vuk Jeremić came second after Guterres.

An earlier favourite, Irina Bokova from

Bulgaria, the head of the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation, fell back into sixth position out of the remaining nine candidates. Bulgaria last week fielded another candidate, European Union Commissioner Kristalina Georgieva, hoping she would do better than Bokova. Leading gender activists have been campaigning for some time for a woman secretary-general - which would be a first in the history of the organisation. Last week, the campaign to elect a woman UN secretary-general said the outcomes of the last straw poll indicated 'disgraceful discrimination against women'. Ban Ki-moon and former secretarygeneral Kofi Annan have also

Even though this is the most open and transparent election of the secretary-general in the 70-year history of the organisation, a confrontation between the big powers could lead to a weak candidate being elected as a compromise, which would be very damaging. Jakkie Cilliers, Head of African Futures and Innovation at the Institute for Security Studies (ISS), says if this happened, the election would once again show that veto power is at the heart of the problem of reforming the UN. 'Everyone agrees in principle that there should be reform, but it is the detail that counts. We need to get rid of the idea that some countries have absolute power,' says Cilliers.

Cilliers has been driving Elect the Council, a campaign that proposes radical changes to the UN, which does not merely mean enlarging or adjusting the UNSC to make it more representative. 'It goes beyond Ezulwini [Africa's call for two permanent members on the UNSC] and other groupings. We have to redesign the whole system,' he says. Africa takes up a lot of the UN's time and resources. More than half of UN

peacekeepers deployed around the world are on the continent: yet Africa doesn't have a big say, or a candidate, in these elections. Currently Senegal, Egypt and Angola serve as non-permanent members of the UNSC. Anton du Plessis, ISS Executive Director, says the new secretarygeneral will play an important role in determining whether African issues are prioritised. Unfortunately this is not the case at the moment,

given the focus on the war in Syria and the global migration issue. 'The UN secre-

tary-general should remind leaders
that Africa is key to solving the root
causes of many of these problems.'
For Africa, the adoption of the
Sustainable Development Goals
(SDGs) by UN members last year
was a huge accomplishment.

However, it will be the task of the secretary-general to make sure the focus doesn't remain only on the concerns of western countries – like counter-terrorism or

Western countries – like counter-terrorism or migration – but will be recalibrated to focus more broadly on development issues, says du Plessis.

Transparency

Du Plessis agrees that the transparency of the election process is key in getting the buy-in of Africans and restoring some of the credibility of the organisation. The UN has been the target of anti-establishment movements worldwide, including in Africa. Many African leaders once again called for reform during the UN General Assembly debates in New York last month. These included Zimbabwe's President Robert Mugabe, who criticised the 'opaqueness' of the election process for a new secretary-general, and the 'unfair and unjust' composition of the UNSC. At a news conference, Mugabe reportedly threatened a withdrawal from the UN by African nations if reform doesn't happen.

Still, Africa relies heavily on the UN for many things – from conflict prevention to humanitarian aid. For Africa, a crucial issue currently is whether the UN will cooperate more closely with the African Union (AU) when it comes to future peacekeeping efforts. At the AU summit in Kigali earlier this year, heads of states adopted a plan for Africa to finance 25% of AU

peacekeeping operations. For the plan to succeed, the UN will have to guarantee that the remaining 75% is covered by assessed UN contributions. This is far from certain, because many big powers have reservations about giving the AU control over peace operations that are largely financed by the UN.

A new secretary-general should also have to ensure that stronger action is taken against peacekeepers accused of sexual abuse. Blue helmets serving in the Democratic Republic of Congo and the Central African Republic have been accused of sexually exploiting vulnerable women and children – those whom they were supposed to protect.

Attention

The current attention on the migration of refugees to Europe is focused mainly on those from Syria – but there are also tens of thousands of Africans who risk their lives to get to Europe every year. Africa should be part of the debate on how to crack down on human smuggling and on ensuring development to help curb economically motivated migration. The position of many African leaders is that migration is a natural, unstoppable phenomenon that should be managed through legal channels, rather than building walls to keep immigrants out.

Africa's voice should also be heard when it comes to solving crises like the civil war in Libya. Africa has been largely side-lined since the 2011 intervention in Libya by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, and yet it continues to bear the brunt of the fall-out from this crisis, notably with terror networks spreading across the Sahel. The current secretary-general has been actively involved in trying to solve some of these conflicts, including those in South Sudan, where UN peacekeepers have been accused of standing by while civilians are being slaughtered. He has also spoken out against the extension of mandates by African leaders.

His successor will have to be a strong candidate, elected through a transparent and fair process, in order for him or her to continue with this work and to do even better in ensuring Africa's voice is heard and its needs are prioritised.

OHANNESBURG - yesterday's General Assembly at the University of the Witwatersrand (Wits) has been postponed as the "mediation process with the protesting students was unsuccessful".

The university said it was announcing the postponement "with deep regret" and said a "Council meeting will be called this weekend after which a way forward for the University will be determined".

"We had reached consensus with all university constituencies including Council, Senate, Convocation, labour and staff, but not with the protesting students," it said in a statement.

"This week, we suspended the academic programme and dedicated all our resources towards building a consensus within the university community in order to be able to resume the academic programme on Monday."

One of the sticking points, Wits said, was that "one of the latest demands of the protesting students is that Wits and all other universities should be shut down until government agrees to free

education".

The Student Representative Council (SRC) late on Thursday night demanded that Wits show its "support" for #FeesMustFall by officially shutting down until government "makes a commitment to legislate free decolonised education for all now".

It also said it wants Wits to "use its position as chair of Universities South Africa to call on all VCs to commit similarly on all campuses" to support #FeesMustFall.

The SRC demanded that should the "government "fail to deliver" free education, Wits "will file a class action against the (government) in the Constitutional Court".

Wits said there had also been "no agreement from the protesting students that the academic programme will continue on

"The protesting students effectively want the General Assembly and the march to the Constitutional Court to continue, without committing that the academic programme will commence on Monday, as previously promised.

There was also no concord "from the protesting students on the format of the General Assembly".

"They are seeking direct engagement from the floor. Our concern in this regard is that it may create unnecessary tension between students themselves and other stakeholders, raising security risks and serving as a symbol of disunity for the university," Wits said.

"There is also a risk that the safety and security of those attending the General Assembly today cannot be guaranteed." timeslive

ConCourt refuses to hear NPA appeal

Constitutional Court has refused for now to hear the National Prosecuting Authority's (NPA) appeal on the North Gauteng High Court judgment which reinstated fraud and corruption charges against President Jacob Zuma, the DA said in a media release yesterday.

"This highlights, yet again, the deliberate attempts by the NPA and Jacob Zuma to do everything possible to delay Jacob Zuma having his day in court," said James Selfe, chairperson of the DA's federal executive.

The full bench of the North Gauteng High Court ruled in April that the 783 fraud, racketeering and corruption charges against Zuma should be reinstated. This was after a seven-year battle by the DA. The court ruled that the decision to discontinue the prosecution against the president should be reviewed and set aside.

On April 6, 2009, then-NPA head Mokotedi Mpshe said transcripts of telephone conversations between then-Scorpions boss Leonard McCarthy and former NPA boss Bulelani Ngcuka, showed political interference in the decision to charge Zuma. The charges were withdrawn in the High Court in Durban on April 7, 2009. In May the NPA said it was seeking leave to appeal, saying there was "considerable public interest" at stake in this matter. It's not our fight - Wits international student

OHANNESBURG - International students at Wits University stand to be uniquely affected by a decision to further suspend the academic programme until next week.

About 3 000 international students, representing 89 nationalities, made up 10% of the student body, university spokesperson Buhle

While they had no direct stake in the outcome of the Fees Must Fall protests, they would nonetheless be affected by the shut-

If the academic programme did not conclude on time, many of these students could face difficulties meeting their visa deadlines.

Some might not be able to legally return to South Africa to continue their studies next year. Zuma said the International Education Association of South Africa (IEASA), on behalf of all universities, had asked the home affairs department for a blanket extension of student visas. After the 2015 Fees Must Fall protests, Home Affairs Minister Malusi Gigaba authorised international students to extend their stay in South Africa. Their study visas would have expired before they had a chance to complete their examinations.

Wits was waiting to hear from IEASA if the department would grant a similar authorisation this year.

Overstaying visas was not international students' only concern. Like many other students, they were anxious about the financial cost of any further delay in their studies.

Freddy Bangelesa, a post-graduate student working on GIS/Remote Sensing, is from the Democratic Republic of Congo. Even if the university covered his fees for next year, extending his stay would still cost him money.

"I need to pay rent, I need to eat. If they shut down today, it will be difficult for me to stay in South Africa next year," he told GroundUp. News24

Opposition leader denies charges, freed

LUSAKA - Zambia's opposition leader Hakainde Hichilema, pleaded not guilty on Thursday to unlawful assembly and sedition charges and was released on bail after spending a night in custody, his party said. Hichilema, leader of United Party for National Development (UPND), is scheduled back in court later this month. If convicted, he could face up to seven years in jail. Hichilema was arrested on Wednesday along with his Vice President Geoffrey Mwamba in the country's copperbelt region, after they attempted to visit party members detained in various prisons. "UPND president Hakainde Hichilema and his Vice-President Geoffrey Mwamba have not pleaded guilty on two different counts," the party said in a tatement.

11 killed in Central African Republic

BANGUI - The United Nations peacekeeping mission in Central African Republic says 11 people were killed and 14 injured in violence this week sparked by the killing of a military official. Mission spokesperson Herve Verhoosel said in a statement on Thursday that calm had returned to Bangui's PK5 neighbourhood, a mostly Muslim enclave where the violence took place. On Twitter, he said 14 people were unaccounted for and might be hiding in fear of more clashes. Army Commander Marcel Mombeka was shot dead in his car in PK5 on Tuesday, sparking unrest that prompted peacekeepers to intervene. Central African Republic has seen deadly sectarian violence since the president of a decade was overthrown in 2013, though a peaceful vote brought President Faustin Archange Touadera to power in February.

Peace agreement could destabilise Mail

Citing a lack of progress on the peace process in Mali, the United Nations peacekeeping chief has warned that the UN mission there would not be able



to fully carry out its mandate as long as the signatories to the peace agreement do not resolutely engage in its implementation. "If the relative respite in recent months leads us to expect a possible improvement of the situation on the ground, we need to face the fact that persistent delays in the implementation of the peace agreement and new violations of the ceasefire are incompatible with lasting stabilisation, albeit partial, of the situation," Under-Secretary-General for UN Peacekeeping Operations Hervé Ladsous told the UN Security Council on Thursday. Renewed protests indicate need for probe

ADDIS ABABA - Humanitarian group, Amnesty International, has called for a probe into a deadly stampede that occurred in Ethiopia last weekend. At least 52 people were crushed to death during an antigovernment protest at a massive religious festival. I Coast opposition attacks 'undemocratic' new constitution

BIDJAN - At least 23 opposition parties in Ivory Coast on Thursday denounced as "undemocratic" President Alassane Ouattara's new draft constitution, claiming it would jeopardise peace in the country.

Ouattara, 73, was re-elected to a second five-year term in October 2015 promising to draft a new constitution, notably suppressing a clause on national identity that has fuelled bloody civil conflict.

Other proposals include setting up a vicepresidency and a Senate of which a third of members would be nominated by the president. The opposition parties called on "Ivorians to defeat this undemocratic initiative that seriously threatens peace and

"You have to vote 'No!'," the coalition's spokesperson Said Morifere Bamba told a news conference, adding that Ivorians were being asked to vote in less than three weeks on a 57-page constitution "they have not even had time to read".

The new constitution was expected to be examined by a committee yesterday before being adopted by lawmakers next week.

The so-called "Ivorian-ness" clause in the existing charter, which took effect in 2000, stipulates that both parents of a presidential candidate must be born on Ivorian soil, and not have sought nationality in another country. The clause became widely resented by people in northern Ivory Coast, many of whom have family ties in Burkina Faso and Mali, and raised a hurdle for Ouattara's bid for the presidency. Morocco vote pits Islamists against liberal party

ABAT - Moroccans voted in parliamentary polls yesterday, five years after an Islamist-led government took office following Arab Spring-inspired protests that toppled regimes across the region.

The Islamist Justice and Development Party (PJD) aims to fight off a liberal opposition which says it wants to roll back the "Islamisation" of Moroccan society.

But the real power will remain in the hands of King Mohammed VI, the scion of a monarchy that has ruled the

North African country for 350 years.

The PJD came to power in 2011, months after massive street protests prompted concessions from the monarchy.

A new constitution transferred some of the king's powers to parliament, at a time when autocratic regimes were falling in Tunisia, Egypt and Libya. Prime Minister Abdelilah Benkirane's PJD heads a coalition including communists, liberals and conservatives.

The PJD says a second term would allow it to press ahead

with its economic and social reforms.

While in government, it passed a controversial reform of the retirement system and followed a relatively liberal economic policy.

Its task has been complicated by the unstable world economy and a drought this year that has hit Morocco's vital agricultural sector and sent growth plummeting.

It has also been weakened by rising unemployment and what critics say is a failure to make good on promises in 2011 to tackle corruption. News24

Britain must pay the price for Brexit - Hollande

PARIS - French President Francois
Hollande has sent one of the strongest
warnings yet that Britain will have to
pay a heavy price for leaving the European
Union, adding to deep concern in financial markets

He called for "firmness" by the EU powers in Brexit negotiations to avoid the risk that other countries might seek to follow Britain's lead and leave the bloc.

The comments added to jitters on financial markets, where the pound yesterday morning suffered its biggest drop since Britain voted in a June referendum to leave the EU.

"There must be a threat, there must be a risk, there must be a price, otherwise we will be in negotiations that will not end well and, inevitably, will have economic and human consequences," he said in a speech on Thursday evening. "Britain has decided on a Brexit, I believe even a hard Brexit. Well, we must go all the way with Britain's will to leave the European Union. "We have to have this firmness" otherwise "the principles of the European Union will be questioned" and "other countries or other parties will be minded to leave the European Union in order to have the supposed benefits and no downsides or rules."

Hollande made the speech to mark the 20th anniversary of the creation of the Institut Jacques Delors, a think tank founded by the former president of the European Commission.

Death toll rises to at least 339 in Haiti

IAMI - Matthew, the first major hurricane threatening a direct hit on the United States in more than 10 years, closed in on Florida on Thursday after killing at least 339 people in Haiti on its destructive march north through the Caribbean. Carrying extremely dangerous winds of 130 mph (215 kph), the storm pounded the northwestern part of the Bahamas en route to Florida's Atlantic coast, the U.S. National Hurricane Center said. Matthew's top sustained winds had dropped to 130 mph by Thursday night. But it remained a Category 4 on the five-step Saffir-Simpson scale of hurricane intensity as it neared Florida, where it could either plow inland or tear along the Atlantic coast through Friday night, the Miami-based center said. Few storms with winds as powerful as Matthew's have struck Florida, and the NHC warned of "potentially disastrous impacts." The U.S. National Weather Service said the storm could be the most powerful to strike northeast Florida in 118 years. Hurricane conditions were expected in parts of Florida late on Thursday or early yesterday and a dangerous storm surge was expected to reach up to 11 feet (3.35 metres) along the Florida coast, Ed Rappaport, deputy director of the Miami-based NHC, said on MANUAL PHY 61

Trump, once a data skeptic, spending millions on data

ASHINGTON Donald Trump
once called data
"overrated" in politics. But
with Election Day swiftly
approaching, the Republican
presidential nominee is
spending millions of dollars
on data and digital services in
an effort to land donations
and win over voters.

Ushering Trump toward a more analytical approach are Jared Kushner, Trump's son-in-law and adviser, and Brad Parscale, the campaign's digital director and a veteran Trump Organization consultant. Both men - friends - are new to politics and have built a team largely without Washington operatives, whom they dismiss as overpaid and overrated. "People underestimate our data and digital because we haven't

been outspoken about what we're doing," Parscale said in an interview.

Modern political campaigns gather up as much data as possible to raise money and identify, reach and turn out voters. They use voter registration files, commercially available information about consumer habits and beliefs, and much more. The most effective campaigns - think President Barack Obama's will arm their employees and volunteers with those analytics to knock on the right doors and make the right phone calls. Data also underpin effective media and digital outreach. "Digital" encompasses mobile apps, advertisements on websites, short videos on social media platforms such as Facebook and Snapchat, and more.

The Trump analytics team

has become increasingly confident in its work, saying the campaign has raised more than \$150m online and produces tens of thousands of different kinds of online content every day to keep up the cash flow and connect with voters.

On big-news days - such as the debate coming on Sunday - the team creates 100 000 pieces of digital content.

"We are data-driven all throughout the campaign," Parscale said. "We don't spend a single dollar unless we know exactly what it's going to buy, who it's going to help us reach." Trump is up against Hillary Clinton's seasoned team. Her director of analytics, Elan Kriegel, helped secure Obama's reelection victory four years ago. *AFP*

Tony Blair hints at political comeback

ONDON - Britain's former prime minister Tony Blair hinted that he wanted to make a political comeback in an interview released yesterday.

Blair, 63, made the comments to Esquire magazine shortly after announcing he was winding down his controversial but lucrative government advisory business.

But he remains deeply unpopular in Britain for his role in taking Britain into the 2003 Iraq war.

Blair told Esquire magazine that it was "an open question" what his future role would be.

"I don't know if there's a role for me... There's a limit to what I want to say about my own position at this moment," he said.

"All I can say is that this is where politics is at. Do I feel strongly about it? Yes, I do. Am I very motivated by that? Yes. Where do I go from here? What exactly do I do? That's an open question."

As leader of the Labour party, Blair won three consecutive general elections from 1997 onwards on a platform of centrist policies.

The party has since shifted sharply to the left under veteran socialist Jeremy Corbyn, a strident opponent of the Iraq war and of Blair himself.

Blair acknowledged there had been "a huge reaction" against his brand of politics but said that centrists must fight back. "I think it's too soon to say the centre has been defeated," he said. "We've got

to rise to that challenge".

Last year, Blair said he felt "more sorrow, regret and apology than you may ever know or can believe" after the Chilcot report found the invasion of Iraq was based on flawed evidence and badly executed.

Pollsters YouGov have found that Blair currently has a public perception rating of 63, with people they surveyed who disliked him describing him as "self-serving" and "money-grabbing".

Last month, Blair announced he was winding up Tony Blair Associates, his advisory business, which has worked with countries including oil-rich Kazakhstan and its autocratic President Nursultan Nazarbayev. *AFP*

4 Killed, 13 Injured in train blasts

NEW DELHI – At least four people were killed and 13 others injured as two explosions hit a passenger train in Pakistan's Baluchistan province, reports channel Dunya News. The bombs went off yesterday near the village of Mach, about 40 miles southeast of the Baluchistan's provincial capital of Quetta. The first explosion targeted the locomotive of the Jaffar Express while the other hit a coach. The wounded passengers were taken to nearby hospitals, some of them are in critical condition. No one has claimed responsibility for the attack, though ethnic Baluch rebel forces claimed similar attacks in the past. *Reuters*

Wing debris found in Mauritius

SYDNEY – A piece of wing debris found in Mauritius is from the MH370, Australia said yesterday, the latest fragment discovered along western Indian Ocean shorelines that has been linked to the missing passenger jet.

The composite debris, recovered from the Indian Ocean island nation in May, "was a trailing edge section of Boeing 777 left, outboard flap, originating from the Malaysian Airlines aircraft registered 9M-MRO (MH370)", the Australian Transport Safety. Bureau (ATSB) said in a report. *AFP*

20 soldiers dead in attack on post

NIAMEY - A local official says gunmen have killed around 20 Niger soldiers guarding a camp of Malian refugees. The official, who spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorised to brief the press, said on Thursday the assailants targeted a military post near the camp in the Tasara region. He could not say how many gunmen were involved or where they came from. He said that besides the fatalities, three soldiers were injured and had been transported to the town of Tahoua for treatment. Northern and central Mali remain unstable nearly four years after France led a military intervention to drive out Islamic extremists. *AP*

Cop acquitted in shooting black man

NORFOLK - A jury in Virginia on Thursday acquitted a white police officer who had been charged in the shooting to death of a mentally ill black man holding a knife. Norfolk police officer Michael Edington faced one count of voluntary manslaughter for shooting David Latham in June 2014. Outside the courtroom, the 'not guilty' verdict revealed the nation's stark fault lines over race and policing. Jeffery Swartz, one of Edington's attorneys, praised the jury for setting aside "national issues and biases" and showing that the criminal justice system "still works". But Latham's family said justice remains elusive for black men and people with mental illness. AP





'Klopp's celebrations inspire Liverpool players to perform'

ONDON - Jurgen Klopp's enthusiastic and passionate celebrations act as a spur for the Liverpool players, says Nathaniel Clyne.

The former Borussia Dortmund coach, who will mark a year in charge at Anfield today, is renowned for his energy and animated persona on the touchline and has proved to be an immensely popular figure since his appoint-

Clyne feels that Klopp has drilled the Liverpool players into a hard-working unit and his own position at right-back means that he is never far from the manager's encouraging noises.

"There's a lot of good, young players out there," he added. "There are a few. I see some of their games and they are doing really well." Goal

Pep Guardiola credits Johan Cruyff for managerial rise

ONDON - Manchester City boss Pep Guardiola says he owes his managerial career to the late, great Johan Cruyff. The 45-year-old former Bayern Munich manager, who learned his trade as a footballer and a coach with Barcelona, feels he was lucky to have met Cruyff. Speaking at the launch of the autobiography Johan Cruyff: My Turn, Guardiola revealed just what the former Ajax and Barca star meant to him as a coach and a person. He said: "I was a lucky guy, I coached City, Bayern and Barca because I met him.

"I thought I knew about football but when I met him, a whole new world opened in front of


"He taught us - not only me, but a generation of players - to understand the game, to understand why you took that decision.

"Football is the most complicated game, it's very open and you have to take a lot of decisions. His impact on people was enormous."

Man Utd target Isco 'doing his

Real Madrid striker Fernando Morientes has praised Isco for attempting to prove a point on the pitch, as speculation over his future continues to rage.

Isco was heavily linked with a potential move away from the Spanish giants in the summer, with

Tottenham and his old side, Malaga, reportedly taking an interest in acquiring his signature, while Manchester United have been linked more recently.

The 24-year-old has admitted that it is not up to him if he will stay at the Santiago Bernabeu but Morientes sympathises with the midfielder's plight, praising his maturity. "All the players are

selfish, we want to play as much as possible," he told Goal "Last matchday, Isco played and, ultimately, when you play for a team like Real Madrid with so much games and competitions, you always find your moment to talk on the pitch.

"That's what Isco is doing, talking on the pitch TARGET: Isco.

"We have the Isco case. the James case... Real Madrid always have these kinds of cases. They're great players. Usually one player has to be ruled out and it's the manager who has to take this decision."

Morientes, who won the Champions League three times as a player, is also intrigued by the friendly rivalry between Alvaro Morata and Karim Benzema for a starting spot

under Zinedine Zidane. "They are great

players that are fighting for a single position, as Zidane has proved he loves 4-3-3 formation," he added.

"They are in charge of materialising all the chances created by Real Madrid. At the end, Zidane has to decide as he sees how players are every day.'

Real have failed to win their last three league games but Morientes maintains that Los Blancos are on track, as they sit joint-top alongside Atletico Madrid.

"It has been like this in the past, it's like this in the present and it will be like this in the future," he replied when asked about the pressure that the club are under.

"It's part of Real Madrid and the responsibility of managing this club. Those who have played [for Real Madrid] know what happens when you lose or draw a game.

"Being leaders alongside Atletico Madrid, it's difficult to say it has been a bad start. It's true that feelings during the last three games have not been

the best but, if Real Madrid had won all the points, then they would have too much advantage. "I think that

means more interest for La Liga and for the competition. We'll see what happens."

Pelle apologises for tantrum

OME - Italy forward Graziano Pelle has been kicked out of the national squad over his angry reaction to being substituted against Spain when he refused a handshake from coach Giampiero Ventura.

The Italian football federation (FIGC) said in a statement that the 31-year-old had been excluded from the squad which will travel to Skopje to face Macedonia in their Group G World Cup qualifier on Sunday. Pelle, who has already apologised for his tantrum, was taken off on the hour after an ineffective display in the World Cup qualifier which ended in a 1-1 draw on Thursday.

"The coach, in agreement with the FIGC, has decided to exclude Graziano Pelle... for disrespectful behaviour when he was substituted," the FIGC said.

"To be part of the national team involves the sharing of values which are worthy of the national team, starting with respect towards the staff, teammates and fans."

Ventura had initially appeared to play down the incident even before the former Southampton player, who is now based with Chinese club Shandong Luneng, had apolo-

"Pelle was angry, I think this was not so much because of the substitution as the way we had played up to that point," he said after the game.

"It's part of football, it's something I've seen many times in my career. But when you wear the Italy shirt, you need to be careful."

Pelle admitted on Instragram that he had "messed things up."

"It was unacceptable behaviour, firstly against the coach and also, towards my teammates, who have always shown me to have important values in this fantastic Italy group we belong to.

Why Neymar would be the perfect signing for Paris Saint-Gemain

ADRID - The French champions chased the Brazil star last summer and it is easy to see why they were so keen on the 24-year-old Barcelona ace.

Since losing Zlatan Ibrahimovic in the summer, Paris Saint-Germain have not looked the same force that they were with the Sweden forward. Of course, some of this is simply due to a team adapting to new coach Unai Emery's style, but a portion of their struggles must be accounted for by the loss of their talisman.

No serious attempt was made to replace the 35-year-old attacker in the summer. Hatem Ben Arfa and Jese were never realistically going to become superstars in the centreforward line, with the former added to provide flair from the periphery of the squad and the latter joining to give Emery another wide option.

Edinson Cavani has, therefore, been left as the sole centre forward in the team. When required in Ligue 1 he has performed, scoring eight times to date already this season, yet doubts linger over the Uruguayan's capacity to shine in big games. He flopped against Arsenal in the Champions League

and against Monaco in Ligue 1 (despite getting on the scoresheet), so PSG cannot risk him being their only option.

The long-term goal of the French side is to supplement him with Neymar, and the Brazilian would prove to be the ideal addition to their ranks.

Not only would the Barcelona star immediately bolster an attacking line that is light in numbers, he would be able to settle in rapidly as he would join a small colony of his countrymen in the capital - Thiago Silva, Marquinhos, Maxwell, Lucas Moura and Brazil-born Thiago Motta.

Indeed, PSG is a club with a long history of helping Brazilians to outstanding success. Rai remains an icon of the Parc des Princes side nearly 20 years after he departed, while Ronaldinho famously thrilled the Parisian crowd for two seasons

before moving to Barcelona. If Neymar was to make the

reverse move, he would fill the void for a headline-grabbing star in the PSG squad. The 24-year-old is used to such pressure, as he fields it each time he turns out for Brazil and he has shown that he is capable of coping with it, too. He helped the Selecao to Olympic gold in 2016, while their disastrous performance at the 2014 World Cup only came after he had departed the competition through injury.

Capable of playing anywhere across the forward line, he has primarily featured from the left for Barca. That could suit PSG, who would use Angel Di Maria to come in off the right flank and continue with Cavani at the forefront of their attack. The unpredictable Lucas would likely be the player sacrificed.


You can't criticise Rooney - Lingard

Manchester United and England winger Jesse Lingard believes that hammering of his captain's performances is unfair, given his extensive successes in the game over the years

Nobody should be criticising Manch ester United and England captain Wayne Rooney because of what he has achieved in the game, according to Lingard.

The winger - recalled to the England squad and hoping to win his first senior cap in the World Cup qualifier against Malta today - does not feel his skipper at club and international level deserves recent negative publicity for his performances.

Rooney has lost his place in United's starting XI and has also seen his position for the national team questioned despite being



kept on as captain after Euro 2016 by former manager Sam Allardyce and new interim boss Gareth Southgate.

"I think that, really, because [of what he's achieved], no-one can

say anything [bad] about him," Lingard told reporters of England's record goalscorer.

"He's determined to get back and hopefully he can do that. I think he's very determined.

"Even though he hasn't been playing for the club, he's still supporting us and he's going to get back into the fold. He's remained captain here, which is great, and that will be great for his confidence as well.

"I've known Wayne for a long time and he's very determined to play. He's got a love for the game which hasn't left him. He's been a top professional on and off the field for us and we look up to him as well.

"For the club, he's a great leader for us - as young lads, we can speak to him whenever we want and he always helps the young lads, which is good. He's been doing it now for a couple of years."





PROSECUTION DEMANDS NEYMAR, BARCELONA BE CHARGED WITH FRAUD

BarceLona - Prosecutors have asked for charges of fraud and corruption to be brought against Neymar, Barcelona and Santos in relation to the Brazil international's move to Camp Nou.

Barca president Josep Maria
Bartomeu and predecessor Sandro
Rosell have also been named in the
case, which has been raised by
Brazilian investment company DIS.

National Court judge Jose de la Mata initially threw out the case in July over a lack of evidence but that decision was overturned in September and the prosecution has now called for the charges to be processed. DIS claims that it is due a 40 per cent cut of the fee that Barcelona paid to sign Neymar from Santos in 2013 - something which it says it has not received in full, given the secrecy over the full cost of the transfer. Barca initially claimed that Neymar cost a total of €57m but the figure was later revealed to be much greater, with Bartomeu declaring that over €100m was ultimately spent on the deal. Barca have protested their



innocence throughout the case, with Neymar insisting that "I'm not a criminal" when the proceedings were initially thrown out.

The club said in September that they will prove their innocence, along with that of Neymar, Rosell and Bartomeu, when the case is taken to trial.

Why Neymar would be perfect for PSG "In this trial, FC Barcelona will

maintain the argument they have always defended during this long process and will demonstrate the innocence of all the investigated parties," they said in a statement.

The case is unrelated to a second legal proceeding against Barca and Neymar, which concerned allegations of tax fraud in relation to his transfer.

Rosberg strikes first blow in Japan

OKYO - World championship leader Nico
Rosberg ended the opening day of practice for the
Formula One Japanese Grand
Prix in a strong position after setting the pace in both sessions yesterday.

The German set his fastest time of one minute, 32.250 seconds on an overcast afternoon in Suzuka in the second of yesterday's two sessions, after also having topped the timesheets at the end of the morning's opening 90-minutes of running.

Rosberg's Mercedes teammate Lewis Hamilton was second in both and while the Briton was 0.214 seconds off his title-rival's pace in the morning he closed the gap to just 0.072 seconds in the second session.

Rosberg extended his advantage over Hamilton to 23 points in the overall standings after the reigning champion was forced to retire 16 laps from the finish while holding a comfortable lead during the last race in Malaysia.

Hamilton heads into Sunday's Japanese round desperately needing to revive his title hopes by clinching a third successive win at the Suzuka circuit.

Their Mercedes team could also wrap up their third successive constructors' crown tomorrow. Kimi Raikkonen ended thirdfastest for Ferrari, 0.323 seconds off Rosberg's pace. The Finn had been fourth-quickest in the morning behind teammate Sebastian Vettel, who was fifth fastest in the second session.

Vettel heads into the weekend carrying a three-place grid penalty for tipping Rosberg into a spin in Malaysia.

Max Verstappen, sixth in the morning, split the two scarlet cars in fourth. His teammate Daniel Ricciardo who inherited the win in Malaysia after Hamilton retired, fell to 12th in the second session from fifth earlier after he was forced to abandon his flying lap when the virtual safety car was deployed after Esteban Gutierrez ground to a halt by the side of the track.

Force India, locked in a battle for fourth in the overall standings with Williams, continued to show a strong turn of speed.

Mexican Sergio Perez went sixth fastest ahead of German Nico Hulkenberg with the duo having set the seventh and eighth-fastest times in the morning.

Fernando Alonso, who survived an encounter with the barriers after losing control of his car at the fast Spoon corner early in the first session, ended the day eighth. © *Reuters*

FA boss to plead guilty in FIFA case

BROOKLYN - A former Costa Rican soccer federation president, who was arrested last year in a US corruption probe involving the sport's global governing body Fifa, was expected to plead guilty yesterday, according to court records.

Eduardo Li, who is also a former member of the executive committee for the North and Central American and Caribbean soccer confederation, CONCACAF, is set to appear in federal court in Brooklyn for a plea hearing, court records show.

A lawyer for Li did not immediate-

ly respond to a request for comment.

Li, a former president of Costa Rica's soccer federation FEDEFUT, is one of 42 individuals and entities charged as part of a US investigation that has rocked Zurich-based Fifa and the soccer world.


The 57-year-old was among seven soccer officials taken into custody in a dawn raid on a luxury Zurich hotel in May 2015. Li had at the time been a member-elect to Fifa's executive committee.

US prosecutors have accused the 42 defendants of engaging in schemes involving more than \$200

million in bribes and kickbacks, which were both sought and received by soccer officials for marketing and broadcasting rights to tournaments and matches. Sixteen people and two sports marketing companies have pleaded guilty to US charges.

Li had been scheduled to face trial in November 2017 with seven other defendants.

At a September 19 hearing, Assistant US Attorney Evan Norris said prosecutors were "in ongoing plea discussions with several of these defendants." © *Reuters*

MURRAY, FERRER THROUGH TO CHINA OPEN SEMIS

BEIJING - Andy Murray beat Davis Cup teammate Kyle Edmund and David Ferrer dispatched German youngster Alexander Zverev as experience won out over youth in the China Open quarterfinals yesterday.

The three-time Grand Slam champion was forced into a tense 20-point tie break in the first set by his 21-year-old compatriot, finally clinching it with a forehand passing shot.

But Edmund who upset 18th-ranked Roberto Bautista Agut in the second round was unable to hold his serve in the second, conceding the match 7-6 (11/9), 6-2.

Zverev, 19, was looking to cap a breakout season with a second title in Beijing, but was unable to capitalise on his first set lead as he was overpowered by Ferrer 6-7 (4/7), 6-1, 7-5.

The German upset the Swiss world No 3 Stanislas Wawrinka to win his maiden ATP title at St. Petersburg in September, having downed No 9 Tomas Berdych in the semis.

In Beijing he beat 10th-ranked Austrian Dominic Thiem in the first round, making him the first teenager to defeat three top 10 players in a row since Boris Becker in 1986.

Despite the loss, Zverev who started the year ranked 83 is expected to rise to 21 when the new rankings are released Monday as he edges towards a place in the top 20 for the first time. © AFP

Keys beats Kvitova in Olympic rematch

BEIJING - In an Olympic effort Madison Keys overpowered Petra Kvitova in the China Open quarterfinals on Friday in their first meet since the Czech denied the American a bronze medal in Rio.

It took two hours and 40 minutes, three sets and two tie breaks for Keys to exact revenge over the double Wimbledon champion, 6-3, 6-7 (2/7), 7-6 (7/5).

A double fault by Kvitova turned the first set in favour of Keys, but she pulled back in the second pushing it to a tie break, which she won.

There was little between the pair in the final set, but Kvitova's 32 unforced errors to Keys' 25 ultimately cost the Czech a semifinal place – and ended her eight-match winning streak. "She made it really tough today. I'm just really happy that at the end I was able to get my serve back on track and get myself ahead in the tiebreaker," Keys told reporters after the match.

Kvitova has had a year of up and downs since she split with her coach of seven years David Kotyza after the Australian Open in January.



She ended last year runner-up in the WTA Finals in Singapore but this season she has failed to get past the round of 16 at any of the Grand Slams, and her ranking fell to 16 – its lowest since 2011.


Keys, 21, made her top-10 debut this year after winning her second career title in Birmingham in June.

The big-hitting youngster – who is often cast as a successor to 22-Grand Slam champion Serena Williams – is

also chasing her first qualification for the elite WTA Finals in Singapore, which features the season's top eight players. With her quarterfinal win she moves into seventh in the Race to Singapore leaderboard, but Briton Johanna Konta is hot on her heels and she needs to win the title in Beijing to clinch her spot.


