



ANGRY SIBAYA KICKS

SUBMISSIONS made by two speakers yesterday irked Sibaya, which led them to be kicked out of the forum.

The speakers' misdemeanour was to speak negatively about the Swazi Law and Customs.

They said the customary laws were not in consistency with the law of the Bible. One speaker, Banele Nkambule from Sidvwashini, said he was sent by God to deliver the statement to His Majesty King Mswati III.

"I am sent by God to tell you, Your Majesty, that we should not mix Christianity with the ancestral religion because the two do not mix,"

The speakers' alleged misdemeanour was to speak negatively about the Swazi Law and Customs. They said the customary laws were not in consistency with the law of the Bible. One speaker, Banele Nkambule from Sidvwashini, said he was sent by God to deliver the statement to His Majesty King Mswati III

Nkambule said to loud screams of disapproval.

He went on to say the Bible was clear on how the nation should worship God. He quoted the book of Leviticus to try and support his statement.

Efforts

But his efforts to support his statement did not bear fruits because the people at the cattle byre had already started booing him. He could not even say the chapter and the verse of the book of Leviticus.

Ludzidzini Acting Governor Timothy Velabo Mtetwa simply told him to move away from the podium because what he was saying was not relevant. "Akusilo linyeva lelo wena wekunene. Bayethe!" Mtetwa said. He was telling Nkambule that what he was talking about was not a problem to himself and other people.

Nkambule was then moved out of the cattle byre and a considerable number of people moved out of the cattle byre, showing that they were not happy with his submission.

Oppressing

Another speaker also tried to do the same but he was not successful.

Quinton, Vincent make submissions at Sibaya

MEMBERS of the Trade Unions Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) yesterday took to the people's parliament to defend themselves from accusations that they 'ratted' on Swaziland at the International Labour Organisation (ILO) Conference in Geneva in June.

TUCOSWA President Quinton Dlamini and the Secretary General Vincent Ncongwane, speaking in their personal capacities, were amongst the first to make their submissions.

It was, however, noted that Noongwane seemed to be ailing as he jumped the queue but while he was delivering his speech he became weak and was whisked away from the platform. Dlamini said TUCOSWA has been in dialogue with government dating back to the 1990s with regard to labour issues but the talks have not yielded anything.

"A lot of people issues have been brought to the ministry of labour and social security's negotiation table but no action was taken," he said.

Necessary

Dlamini said some of the facts that came up at the ILO Conference were not necessarily false but it was what actually happened.

"It is true that Muzi Mhlanga's tooth was removed as a result of a fall out with the police," he said.

Dlamini further stated that the minister did not directly say TUCOSWA was the one responsible for lobbying other worker representatives against Swaziland but some other people have mentioned that it was indeed TUCOSWA.

He further clarified that African
Growth Opportunity Act (AGOA)
was not lost because of
TUCOSWA but such was a decision made by the United States of
America and US workers.

Promised

He further promised to bring the documents and speech they presented at the ILO Conference to the King so he can get the clarity that TUCOSWA was not responsible for what they have been accused of. "TUCOSWA never said or lobbied that Swaziland be put under the Special Paragraph. ILO has their own judges that make decisions," he said.

Dlamini also lamented on the calibre of the people who are advising the King saying they were not being truthful, but promised that the record will be set straight.

People request for personal assistance from King

AS the people's parliament entered its fourth day, more and more Swazis declared their plight to His Majesty King Mswati III rather than submitting issues of national magnitude.

This saw a few incidents of name-dropping that the people had been earlier warned against. Women mostly utilised the opportunity to submit as a chance to relay the plight they face in their lives.

Widows decried of having their ploughing fields being forcefully taken from them, facing the problem of taking care of orphaned and vulnerable children (OVC) yet they are aged and not working. Meanwhile, other asked the King to help them with their education. Sibongile Shongwe said the 'Bobandlancane' (chief's inner council mem-

bers) come to them and use the King's name in fraudulently getting land from the widows, but amazingly they sell the land to people who are not even from the same communities.

Ludzidzini Governor Velabo Timothy Mtetwa warned Sibaya against bringing issues that are not of national importance to this forum.

Issues

"You must submit issues that will benefit the whole nation rather than issues that affect yourselves only. If you have a problem, there are specific routes that one has to take back in the communities, these issues should be addressed by chiefs. If you have exhausted all these avenues then you must mention it before you declare your plight," he said.

Sibaya congratulates King on SADC chairmanship

ALMOST all the people who made submissions at the people's parliament congratulated His Majesty on assuming the chairmanship of the Southern Africa Developing Community (SADC).

The official handover will take place during the SADC Summit later this month.

Mnikati Ndlangamandla said he was quite happy that the King has been given the great opportunity to host and be chairman of SADC. "Firstly, I would like to congratulate you Your Majesty on this very important role that you will be assuming," he said.

Vision

"It shows that you were not just named Makhosetive, but it was a vision and it has now come to pass that you will be the leader of all nations, Your Majesty.

"The SADC Summit is attesting to your birth name," said one speaker.

Bennett submits for 20minutes instead of 5 minutes

MBABANE businessman Walter Bennett was given privileged treatment when he was allowed to make submissions for a good 20 minutes, while others were only given five minutes.

And he sure utilised the time as he raised a litany of important national issues. He now and again received a round of applause in his careful and eloquent usage of Siswati phrases.

Bennett said since it has been quite a while since the country had a people's parliament, he had quite a number of issues to discuss and relay to his King.

Bennett said he was actually pleased that TUCOSWA leadership

finally appeared before the people's parliament to give their side of the story as regards the Geneva episodes.

"I will not dwell on that issue, however, TUCOSWA has not yet given a straight and appropriate explanation of what they actually said in Geneva," he said.

Shocking


He said it was quite shocking that while they were flown to Geneva at government's expense and accommodated in the same manner they did what they did. But Bennett said he trusts that though they might have done what they did he believes all Swazis would eventually come back to the King.

"We know clearly that the Bible tells us that Christianity and the ancestral religion do not go together. If we want to truly practice the Christian religion, we have to stop worshipping ancestors," Mbuli said.

He was booed by the members of the people's parliament and Mtetwa did not hesitate to let him go away from the podium. "Kwakho wedvwa loko wena wekunene. Lelive leli liyahambisana kakhulu nenkholo yebuKristu. NemaKhosi lombala aze alishumayele livi," Mtetwa said.

He was telling Mbuli that the authorities of the country were Christians and they encouraged Swazis to embrace Christianity as a religion. Mbuli then went back to sit among the people who had come to attend Sibaya. Mbuli was unfortunate though because the people showed clearly that they did not want him to be among them because of what he

Macaleni Dlamini accused of stealing cattle at Sibaya

MACALENI Dlamini was accused of forcefully taking cattle in Mpolonjeni, Siteki.

He was accused by Moses Mngometulu, the man whose cattle he allegedly took.

Mngometulu was talking during the fifth day of Sibaya (cattle byre) at Ludzidzini yesterday, where he was voicing his hurt before His Majesty King Mswati III.

"Sivebelwa tinkhomo le Siteki, titsatswe tonkhe tami nangingekho ekhaya tatsatswa ngu Macaleni Dlamini bana Bongani Vilakati ngatsi nangiya kubo watsi Macaleni kimi uyinkhosi kwayena ngoba atfunywe nguwe Ngwenyama," Mngometulu

Loosely translating to "they

take our cattle in Siteki, all mine were taken while I was away from home by Macaleni Dlamini and Bongani Vilakati, who when I approached told me they were sent by you Your Majesty"

Reason

Moses mentioned that he did query Macaleni on why he took all his cattle but he never got a clear reason and has since been facing serious altercations with the dip tank veterinary officers as he still has the permits.

"I have made numerous attempts to approach you Your Majesty in vain as 1 keep being turned back, so I am here before you to request a solution as I am beyond being hurt," he begged.

He also added that he feels like crying every time he sees Macaleni.

Anti-Corruption must be more active - Bennett

FORMER senator Walter Bennett said the Anti-Corruption Commission needs to be more active and have their presence felt as the country has more and more people misappropriating funds.

"If there is a need for a supplementary budget for the Anti-Corruption Commission so that it is be more active, government should see to it that such happens." he said.

Bennett also referred to the issue of Circular No.1 which was discussed at the last people's parliament. He said it was apparent that politicians were the only people who would ever have money, lamenting that schools are suffer-

ing, while politicians are enjoying a 32% salary increase. "They say it is an automatic increase, what is that? The country will run out of money soon in the way things are happening, what will happen then, they will run to His Majesty and report that the country has no money," he said. Bennett said politicians were giving themselves money as they please.

Criticise

"I am not here to criticise the prime minister, but we have to find a way forward in all of this," he said. Bennett further said he was disappointed that from the last people's parliament there has been not change. "I ask you Your Majesty that there be a review on the

Constitution on the right to recall. The code of conduct of parliamentarians must be reviewed after a few years," he said. Bennett went on to punch holes on the issue of government parastatals and municipal councils that use state funds to push their agendas and take employees to court.

He said unlike the municipals, the employees used their own money instead of state funds to defend themselves which put them in a bad financial state, since individuals' money run out while the municipals does not. "Companies must stop spending too much money on soccer but instead they should invest a lot of money in education," he said.


CONCERNS ABOUT REPORTING BACK ON LAST SIBAYA

A number of people at Sibaya were concerned that they were not given a report of what transpired after the last people's parliament that took place in 2013.

Simangele Mtetwa of Mpolonjeni said she was expecting that the National Secretary Nhlanhla Dlamini would give Sibaya feedback on what transpired then.

She further spoke against the people who made submissions about their own personal problems saying they were using the wrong forum. "We are supposed to be discussing issues of national importance here and finding a way forward on these," she said.

Mtetwa further said she does not believe that there are organisations that 'ratted out' Swaziland but instead government leaders go to the international forums to sign agreements that the country would adhere to certain laws but end up

not following them. "The international forums become concerned and they ask if Swaziland is adhering to the laws. Swaziland signed the Freedom Charter, but the people here are not told about these things.

Problem

The problem is that the people around the King are so corrupt and they do not tell His Majesty the truth about matters. The

International Convention of Civil Rights was also signed and Swaziland agreed on having unions," she said.

Mtetwa further said the exercise of electing members of parliament has proven not to be working for Swaziland. "There is no reporting back from the MPs, there is no cutting of terms for underperforming MPs," she said.

People living with albinism must be taught self-defence - Sibaya

SIBAYA has suggested that to stop the killing of people living with albinism, they should be taught self-defence.

This was stated by Mlimi Maziya from KaLanga who mentioned that this can be successful by grooming them from a tender age to

join security forces of the country, where they would learn self-defence.

"They need to be groomed from a young age on how to defend themselves when attacked, so they should be put in these security forces where they will learn such," he said.

I CAN CURE HIV/AIDS -TITI SHABANGU

Shabangu said this at the people's parliament.

Shabangu, from Sihhohhweni, said her land was fertile and full of trees from which she could generate the herbs to make tablets to cure HIV/AIDS.

















Council employee slams officer's E140 000 salary

AN employee of the Municipal Council of Mbabane has slammed an officer, he did not name, who gets paid a staggering E140 000 a month. However it is known that the officer is CEO Gideon Mhlongo.

The employee was speaking during the people's parliament (Sibaya), at Ludfzidzini Cattle Byre yesterday, saying the officer had made their lives miserable. Jabulani Fakudze said the officer had made it clear that he would retrench over 100 employees at the municipality. He said such behaviour cast doubts about the country's Vision 2022, saying it was dampening their hopes for the country. He was of the view that the way Swazis were treating one another in this country was the one thing that would hinder the realisation of Vision 2022. Fakudze said in the last Sibaya, which was in 2012, His Majesty King Mswati III spoke against retrenching workers. He said what was quite unfortunate was that they were facing the same situation.

He said the particular officer was the same man who was fired for corruption. "That man came back and he told us that he came here for one thing

only, and that was to retrench us," Fakudze said. He went on to state at the people's parliament that their case was so serious that they even went to seek the King's intervention


(Kwembula Ingubo). Fakudze lamented, however, that their act was not successful. He told the King that their situation was not fair because the man he was talking about was earning E140 000 per month as a salary. He said the officer's salary was way above what he was earning as a street sweeper, as he gets only paid E4 000 a month.

He also complained of the fact that the money they would earn, once they get retrenched, would last them for five months. He asked the King to intervene and help them in this matter.

Meanwhile, Bheki Ngwenya urged government to provide a subvention for Matsapha Town Board because, according to him, this was not happening. "Workers there do not get decent pay," Ngwenya said.

He went on to say Matsapha was an industrial hub and that meant it was also working towards attaining Vision 2022. He urged Minister of Housing and Urban Development

Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza to find time to his schedule to go to Matsapha to find out how things were going in that

No clapping of hands at Sibaya – TV

CLAPPING hands is strictly prohibited when inside the cattle byre, at Ludzidzini Royal Residence.

This was said by Ludzidzini Governor, Timothy Velabo Mtetwa yesterday during the people's parliament. Mtetwa repeatedly said this as people would now and again fail to control their emotions. They would show their support for a speaker by clapping hand or shout at the top of their voices in jubilation.

Bekunene, atishaywa tandla lapha esibayeni seNkhosi. KuseNkhosini lapha kuyahlonishwa. Bayethe!" Mtetwa said. He was telling the people that they should avoid clapping hands and show respect in the cattle byre, because it belonged to the King. There are incidents where some people would clap hands when speakers were making submissions. Several speakers lambasted Mtetwa himself, together with Manzini Regional Administrator Prince Gcokoma. Other acts that are prohibited in the cattle byre include naming and shaming individuals, using cellphones and crying.

Prince Gcokoma was accused by speakers of hindering development in the Manzini region, while Mtetwa was accused of denying people

access to the King.

One example, where people clapped their hands, was when one speaker submitted that the retirement age for Swaziland should be reduced to 50 years of age. Sister Dlamini from Ludzeludze was of the view that this would help in reducing the rate of unemployment in the country.

"The death rate is so high in such a way that people die almost every day. It is almost difficult for people nowadays to reach the age of 60, which is the retirement age, in this country. To give opportunities for the youth to be employed too, I suggest that those who are working now should be made to retire at 50 years. By

doing so the youth will be able to get employed in this country," Dlamini said.

She went on to say the senior employees in the security forces should be motivated because they were no longer happy. She complained of the fact that some workers in the security forces would be promoted, even if they had only five years experience working

This happened in the presence of senior officials, who had about 15 years of experience, who would find themselves having to report to the junior officials.

Problem

Dlamini said the problem was those promoted would also be given extra allowances for doing other duties during national events. "There are a lot of people who are not working in this country, they should be hired to work during national events" she said

She also advised the King to stop going with one and the same people abroad when he was going on state visits or any other trips. She then warned the King of the danger of not attending to the plight of the officers in the armed

She said these were the people who were responsible for his safety and if they were not happy, his safety would be at risk. This is how she received a round of applause, which was rebuked by Mtetwa.

What was a concern to Shongwe was the money that was spent by the nation in trying to groom him to be what he was. He said Jele still had a huge role to play in making sure that the destiny of the youth of Swaziland reached greater heights.

Jele is said to have had his contract not renewed by the SNYC in 2011.

This was after allegations that he had advanced himself a sum of E24 000 from the coffers of the council. This was one of the charges he is said to have been facing.

Reinstate

"If it is difficult to reinstate Jele as a leader of the Swaziland National Youth Council, I suggest that he should be consulted on youth issues, wherever he is because the country invested a lot in him," he said. Shongwe said this after he had thanked the King for coming up with the Swaziland National Youth Enterprise Fund.

He said this fund was coming directly from the King because he was a patron of Club 29, an organisation that was committed to improving the life of a young person.

Shongwe expressed his gratitude on the fund because to him, His Majesty was investing in the future of the country. He said the youth was the future of the country, so they should be taken care of for the country to have a brighter future.

He said the fund would help the youth start businesses that would employ a lot of other Swazis and the economy would improve by so doing.

TV at pains correcting Swazis

ACTING Governor of Ludzidzini Royal Residence, Timothy Velabo Mtetwa was yesterday at pains trying to guide Swazis on the appropriate way for addressing His Majesty King Mswati III at the ongoing People's Parliament.

It was quite apparent that some Swazis were not versed on the appropriate language, and cultural etiquette, they were required to adopt, the tough-talking governor would, from time, to time remind and redirect those straying from the acceptable norms.

Mtetwa is substantive governor for Zombodze Royal Residence, near Kwaluseni in Manzini.

Amongst the unacceptable practices at the cattle byre, Governor Mtetwa listed the clapping of hands for whatever reason, even if it is in appreciation of a speaker's view-point; pronouncing insults, even if attempting to explain how one was insulted speakers are not allowed to repeat the insults.

It is also culturally wrong for participants to whistle in appreciation of a person's contribution, as such a salutation is only reserved for the head of the nation, the

Phangothi Investments wins back its property

HIGH Court Judge Nkululeko Hlophe has set aside the sale of a property belonging to Phangothi Investments, after it was discovered that it was sold at a different place than advertised.

He ordered the Registrar of Deeds to cancel registration of Lots 118 and 119, situated at Matsapha Industrial Area, from the name of Taga Investments back to the ownership of Phangothi Investments.

Property

The property was sold through Public Auction in Manzini, near Jubilee Park after Phangothi Investments had failed to settle its loan with Swazi Bank. Taga Investments purchased the two plots at E3 million reserve price. However, Phangothi Investments challenged the validity of the auction sale, on the grounds that it had taken place at a different place from that which had been advertised in the notice of sale, being 'outside the Manzini Regional Administrator's offices.

The company said the auction was held at the old Manzini Regional Administrator's offices, near the jubilee park, and this prevented other would be buyers form participating in the auction sale, which could have raised the purchase price.

The judge said the two places were very far apart and rejected Swazi Bank's argument that auction sales were generally conducted at that place.

"It can hardly be in dispute that the purpose of a sale by auction is to ensure that the property being sold is sold to the highest bidder, which is to say; it is sold for the highest possible price.

The underlying argument being that, if the property is sold at a different place than advertised, such has the tendency of defeating this purpose because other would be bidders may end up not attending, where their attendance could have influenced the sale towards achieving its purpose," judge Hlophe said. He said the improper mention of the address where the auction was

to be conducted, possibly resulted in the failure to allow as many, interested purchasers as possible who, through their participation would have curbed possible collusive dealing in the sale of properties in execution.

The judge also said the precise mention of an address for an action sale not only benefits the judgment debtor and the judgment creditor to enable the former to be paid handsome residue.

Possibility

"Instead, it is also meant to ensure that the property is sold for the highest possible price in an open and fair market so, as to eliminate the possibility of collusion to eliminate other bidders between any role payers; particularly the deputy sheriff conducting the sale and the eventual buyer, by either ambiguously advertising the place of the sale or improperly describing the property," Hlophe said.

He said ambiguity and inaccuracy should be discourage d in auction sales.

He found that the auction sale was conducted in a different place from that which had been advertised, therefore held that it was null and void. He set the sale aside and directed that the property should be reregistered in the name of Phangothi Investments. Taga Investments has said it had been granted a loan to purchase the property and was an innocent third party.

The senior magistrate was speaking during a trial of one of the drink-driving suspects. Mduduzi Sibiya of Mlindazwe had appeared before the court after he was arrested and charged with contravening the Road Traffic Act

Failed

He was alleged to have wrongfully, unlawfully and intentionally driven his motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol. It was alleged that a breathalyser test indicated that the accused person had 0.97 mg/l of alcohol in his blood system. Particulars of the offence also included that the accused failed to comply

with the police when they signalled him to stop, resulting in them having to chase after him for about five kilometres. It was alleged that the accused person was also staggering and had a strong smell of alcohol coming from his mouth. When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence. His plea was also accepted by the crown without leading evidence to prove commission.

Guilty

He was accordingly found guilty by the court. In mitigation, the accused told the court that he did not see the police when they signalled him to stop as their motor

vehicle was hidden in the bush next to the road. He said he was surprised when a man who was dressed like a police officer suddenly emerged from the bush and attempted to stop him.

The accused said a motor vehicle which had its lights switched off then chased after him after he did not stop when the man signalled him to do so. He said at first, he thought he was being chased by thugs who wanted to hijack him. He said he only realised that it was actually the police when they eventually caught up with him. Meanwhile, the accused was eventually sentenced to three months imprisonment with an option to pay E1 000

Soccer fan fined E3 000 for slapping cop

ONE of the scuffles that occurred during the SwaziTelecom Charity Cup games at Somhlolo National Stadium on Sunday resulted in one fan being fined E3 000 for slapping a female police officer.

The accused, Nkosingiphile Mbhamali, is alleged to have attacked the uniformed female police officer while she was trying to control one of the several skirmishes that erupted during the one day tournament. After the alleged hot clap, it is said Mbhamali was instantly whisked away into a police van, which resulted in him spending a



night at Lobamba Police Station.

Charged

Mbhamali appeared before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi after being charged with assault common, and he pleaded guilty to the offence.

Nhlabatsi then asked why he hit the police officer and the accused stated that it was a mistake as he had never beaten a person before. "I

was trying to separate people that were fighting when the police approached us, and I mistakenly slapped the female police officer who was in uniform. I am still shocked by this too, as it's uncharacteristic of me. I still cannot believe that I slapped a police officer," he said. As mitigation continued, Mbhamali further apologised for his actions and said he would never be found to have committed such an offence ever again.

"I am sorry Your Worship and as a first offender I ask the court to be lenient with me," he said. Mbhamali was found guilty as per his plea and was slapped with a fine of E3 000 or spend two years in jail cells.

BUSINESSMAN ESCAPES 'LANDELA' GANG'S CLUTCHES

THE notorious 'Landela' gang has upped their tricks as they now target desperate sugarcane farmers in Lubombo Region.

According to a victim, the crew famously known as 'Landela', almost stole his hauling machinery worth E1 million over the past weeks.

The businessman, who spoke on condition of anonymity, said he received a call from an unknown man who claimed to have a tender for him. "The conmen are taking advantage of the fact that this year there are a few tenders."

He said he received a call and he was promised a big tender at Siphofaneni, where there are large farms of sugar cane along the Usuthu River. He said they arranged a meeting which was conducted under a tree.

Fateful

"On that fateful day of the meeting, my instinct told me that there is something amiss where I was going."

He said he then asked his son to drive him to the meeting place. Upon arrival, he met four men who pretended to have a farm that was waiting to be harvested end of July and were looking for serious subcontractors to who have grab loaders.

"I was told to declare some of the items that I own and I told them I was going provide a cane loader and gleaners."

He said the Bells cane loader, which was bought from Swazi Track, is worth E1 million. The farmer said he came into agreement with the conmen that they would start working on a Monday.

"On our way home, my son warned me not to take the tender offered by the strangers. My son told me that amongst the four men, one was familiar. He told me he works with the notorious Landela gang in Matsapha-Manzini corridor."

Conmen

The farmer said on the Sunday he got non-stop calls from the conmen, who wanted him to confirm the time and route the driver was going to use when coming to Siphofaneni.

"I then turned them down by telling them that the machinery had mechanical faults, so I need to take it for servicing."

Another source said the conmen are all over Siphofaneni, Big Bend and the surrounding areas. "Another man was made to work

"Another man was made to work at a certain farm for the whole season without getting paid."

In this particular instance, the conmen are said to have entered to a contract with the farmer and they submitted their personal account.

'Chiefs behind mushrooming homesteads'

SOME chiefs are said to be directly responsible for the illegal mushrooming homesteads in areas that are historically reserved as grazing land.

Land Management Board (LMB) Chairman Clement Dlamini said his committee, although directly tasked with ensuring such illegal and uncontrolled settlement of people was prevented, had no instrument which it could invoke to reverse such societal damage if already done by the chiefs.

Dlamini said they don't even have penalties that they could impose on those chiefs violating the national resettlement policy.

The former minister for agriculture said the land management board was deeply concerned that in several areas land that was reserved for national projects or for food production has been wrongly utilised. "It is a pity that we have no authority over the areas in which no resettlement was done," said Dlamini.

He said his committee was only able to intervene on areas where proper resettlement was done by the area's authority and that some peo-



ple were just violating the agreed arrangement. Dlamini said the responsibility to initiate the resettlement rested with the chiefs and that his committee was not supposed to impose it on them.

"We only assist with technical expertise when are requested, otherwise it remains the sole responsibility of the chiefs to decide how to settle his subjects by setting aside settlement areas, grazing lands and food production areas," said Dlamini.

Dlamini and the members of the land management board have been to several chiefdoms, throughout the country, to appeal to residents and community leaders alike to desist from practices, which eventually lead to the misuse of land, a scarce non-renewable resource. Some concerned Swazis have raised the matter at the ongoing people's parliament at Ludzidzini Cattle byre, accusing chiefs and their councils of allocating land willy-nilly without a care whatsoever on the future uses of the land.

Of major concern was that land, that should be used for food production, was now allocated to individuals for residential settlements to the detriment of the nation.

The effects of these bad practices and irresponsible actions are overgrazing which result in soil erosion and, most unfortunately, food insecurity.

Network Interruption

Hands off my property, says DJ Peace to Amandla

POPULAR Disk Jockey Mxolisi Mthethwa has filed a court application seeking an order barring Amandla Financial Services from reattaching his personal belongings for a debt incurred by his company.

Mthethwa, popularly known as DJ Peace, claims that his company, Peace Entertainment was early in the year ordered by the Mbabane Magistrate's Court to repay Amandla Financial Services E28 263 plus collection commission and six percent interest. He says he directs his company together with Makhosazana Dlamini.

He has alleged that on September 3, 2014, when

Peace Entertainment was granted the loan facility, he and Dlamini placed themselves as sureties. Each director signed their own deed of suretyship to the effect that in the event their company fails to honour its indebtedness, each would be

responsible for half.

Attached

However, Mthethwa has alleged, a messenger of court attached his personal belongings at his residence, instead of Peace Entertainment's assets which were available at its offices.

He submitted that such was erroneous, because the summons had been served on the company's premises. He also submitted that the legal operational procedure dictates that the judgment debtor's assets are first attached and only when that property doesn't settle the full amount owed, after

public auction, are the sureties' properties attached.

He claimed that in March, he paid Amandla Financial Services E12 000 and E3 000 in April. He claimed that he was only indebted to the creditor for E16 000, therefore the balance expected from him was E1 000.

"Immediately after I had settled my part of indebtedness as set out in the deed of suretyship, I elected to remove my personal belongings from my residence, which I believe I was entitled in the circumstances," he said.

Claimed

However, he said on August 2, he was contacted by Amandla Financial Services General Manager Bongani Phakathi, informing him to sur-

> render the personal belongings he had removed because they were under attachment. He claimed that Phakathi threatened to institute legal proceedings and charge him with contempt if he failed to pay the balance in the amount

He submitted that the financial services provider should institute legal proceedings against his co-director Makhosazana Dlamini and demand payment of the other E16 000. He submitted that he had settled a huge part of his indebtedness and would settle the E1 000 balance thereof immediately.

Amandla Financial Services is yet to file its responding papers in the matter. Mthethwa is represented by lawyer Vusi Thomo from Elvis Maziya Attorneys in the matter.

Man gets 7 years for killing step brother

Linda Jele High Court

A 23-year-old man has been sentenced to seven years imprisonment for killing his step brother.

Wandile Dlamini was charged with culpable homicide after stabbing his step father's son Senzo Dlamini. The incident happened in September 2009 and Wandile spent a month in prison before he was admitted to bail. He appeared before High Court Judge Qinisile Mabuza on Thursday.

Wandile had been charged with murder, but he pleaded guilty to culpable homicide, a plea which was accepted by the crown. He was convicted by the court as per his own plea. In his mitigation, Wandile submitted that after the death of his biological father, his mother got married to Senzo's father. He also submitted that Senzo was four years older than him.

He said he and his mother then proceeded to stay at his step father's home and his relationship with Senzo was not good ever since they started staying together. He submitted that the deceased was the aggressor in the incident and he retaliated by stabbing him with an okapi knife.

He submitted that the deceased was the author of his own misfortunes. He told the judge that he only went as far as Form Two at school and asked the court to consider that he had observed the bail conditions to the letter. The crown informed the court that Wandile was a first offender.

In passing sentence, the judge said she would consider Wandile's personal circumstances and submissions. However, she would have to



also take into account that Wandile took the life of his step brother and had carried a wicked knife at the age of 16 years.

"The question being, who was he arming himself against? I also have to take into account the interests of society. There are too many casual deaths in the country and would be offenders must be deterred from

committing such offences. Courts are enjoined to pass sentences that will send a message that such offences will not be tolerated,"
Judge Mabuza said.

She then sentenced Wandile to seven years imprisonment without the option to pay a fine. She suspended two years of the sentence for a period of two years on condition Wandile would not be convicted of an offence of which assault would be an element, during the period of the suspension.

She also stated that the period between September 21 and October 21, 2009, Wandile spent in prison would be deducted from the sentence.

'Avoid double membership'

THE Swaziland Principals
Association (SWAPA) has advised
its members to divorce other organisations and register their organisation.

SWAPA is now on the verge of signing a recognition agreement with government. They could not do so before because the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) objected, claiming that principals still belonged to them.

SWAPA Vice President, Welcome Mhlanga said this would not be an easy thing to do.

He was speaking during a farewell function for Hhohho principals, who had retired from the teaching profession, held at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre last Friday.

It was organised by the Hhohho branch of SWAPA where Senator Ndumiso Mdluli had been invited as a guest speaker.

The retired principals included Simon Mthunzi, Benson Dlamini, Julius Dlamini, Gladness Nkambule, Savinah Dlamini and Edward Mgavu. "We have to avoid double membership at all costs because this is against the dictates of the Industrial Relations Act of 2000. We cannot be members of SWAPA and still belong to other organisation. We have to sign divorce papers with the other organisation and become fully fledged SWAPA members," Mhlanga said.

Mhlanga, however, did not name the organisation that he was talking about. However, it is a well known fact that members of SWAPA also affiliate under the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT).

Growing

Mhlanga said the Hhohho branch of his organisation was working hard in growing its membership base. This branch is headed by Thabo Nkambule, who is a principal at Mater Dorolosa Primary School.

He urged them to share their recruiting strategies with the other regional bodies of SWAPA.

Mhlanga, when asked about the number of members they now have, declined to answer. He said this was still a secret.

He added that the way SWAPA was growing, it showed that the organisation was growing in leaps and bounds. He expressed hope that the growth of the organisation would restore the dignity of school principals. He warned those who were taking SWAPA for granted that they were in for a big surprise.

The vice president then went on to say the cooperative belonging to them was growing too. "The treasurer of Emachawe Emfundvo, our savings and credit cooperative, told me that he is happy when he sees the way our money increases. This tells me that you also have confidence in Emachawe Emfundvo," he said.

SWAPA member Julius Dlamini said principals were actually recognised but it was only the organisation that was not recognised.

Dlamini was speaking on behalf of the retiring Hhohho principals. "Principals were recognised by government the day they were appointed. It is only the organisation that has to be recognised now," Dlamini said.

He urged the principals to work towards making the teaching profession a respectful one. He said the future generation should want to be teachers; not to earn money, but to be dignified for plying their trade in such an important profession.

We have been sidelined -Maphungwane residents

RESIDENTS of the Bhekizwe community, under Maphungwane Chiefdom, feel rejected and sidelined by the authorities of the area.

They claim to be starving as no one seems to care about them. The community, which forms the larger fraction of Maphungwane, is known as the stronghold of the faction, refusing to accept Chief Maliwa as the rightful ruler of the area.

The residents were last month turned back from a food distribution exercise, which was facilitated by Caritas Swaziland, after it was alleged that the list of the residents went missing.

The residents have now appealed for food aid saying they are starving. Apparently, residents of the area had only benefitted once from the food aid early this year after government embarked on the exercise to intervene in the drought effects.

Maphungwane is one of the areas which are in serious need of food aid. Currently, residents of the area struggle to even get drinking water.

The residents have alleged that they have been intentionally side-lined from many development projects by the authorities of the area. They pointed out that this became evident when they were turned back from a food distribution exercise.

Some of the residents have also alleged that they are having difficulty in accessing projects such as electricity schemes, which are usually partly funded by the constituency through the Regional Development Fund (RDF).

"Ever since we were labelled as the stronghold of the opposition faction, we have been struggling get any form of assistance from the traditional authorities of the area," said one of the residents.

The residents are now appealing to the public to assist with food aid. Some children from the area were recently reported to have dropped out of school due lack of food. Most children are said to be now attending school mainly for food than lessons.

In a previous interview, constituency headman Boy Matsenjwa had reported that the residents will receive their share of the food aid in the next distribution.

Government's slow delivery irks SWAPA

SWAPA is complaining about government's slow delivery which disturbs them in their work.

SWAPA Vice President, Welcome Mhlanga, spoke strongly about the lack of service delivery shown by government. This was in regard to the grants that are supposed to be disbursed by government to schools across the country. He directed his complaint to Senator Ndumiso Mdluli, who is also chairperson of the Senate portfolio committee in the ministry of education and training. He was invited to the gathering as a guest speaker.

"The issue of government grants is a pain to the principals because it disturbs the operations of the schools. How can schools be expected to operate efficiently when pupils will write mock examinations without the grants being availed to schools?" Mhlanga asked. He mentioned the Free Primary Education (FPE), Orphaned and Vulnerable Children (OVC) and the European Union (EU) as being the grants that were not being disbursed in time to schools. He told Mdluli that the issue needed to be tackled with boldness. He urged the senator to make efforts to end this tendency by government so that schools could be run efficiently and effective-

Shops in Nhlangano reject old coins

SOME of the shops in Nhlangano no longer accept pre-2014e Swazi coins.

This has caused confusion for members of the public as they said this was way before the deadline that was announced by the Central Bank of Swaziland regarding the issue of old coins.

The Central Bank issued notices that some of the coins would stop circulating from September 1 and advised the public to return all the old coins

Most of the people when coming to buy something in some of the shops are told that such coins were not accepted and this has caused frustration, for those who were not even aware of the arrangement.

Sonyboy Mahlaba, a taximan, said he found himself a laughing stock at Wozani Supermarket where he had gone to buy some items only to be told that the money he was carrying was no longer accepted at the shop.

"The lady on the till told me that they no longer take coins from 2014 backwards and only accepted those from 2015.

I tried to ask the reason with her but she told me that it was an order from the management. I was frustrated and when I wanted to know how I could be assisted, she told me that there was no way and I left the shop disappointed," said Mahlaba.

Mahlaba said he was blank about the issue of old coins being removed from circulation, saying even then the shops needed to display a notice.

"I heard that the Central Bank issued a notice that some of the coins would no longer be in use. However, I don't think it was said this should happen before August. There are shops and other businesses which now do not take these coins.

Screen

At Wozani Supermarket, for instance, when you reach the till, they screen all coins you bring and they don't take coins bearing years from 2014 backwards. They simply tell you that they can't take them and can't help you with anything," said Mahlaba.

Another taximan, only identified as Dludlu, also said he encountered the same problem when he had gone to buy groceries from the same supermarket. "It's frustrating and some of us have all along been of the view that the coins will stop being taken at the beginning next month (September).

At Wozani Supermarket, I have been turned away several times. They sometimes tell me to go to the bank and this is time consuming," said Dludlu.

He also stated that they were expecting a delegation from Swaziland to grace the event. However, their expectations were not met as only about two people had been sent from Swaziland.



The prince mentioned that the reason was mainly because the country was engaged in an on-going people's parliament, commonly known as Sibaya.





GIRL [13] HEADS FAMILY OF FOUR

A 13-year-old girl has been forced to take care of her 84-year-old blind grandmother and her two younger siblings after they were all abandoned by their parents.

The minor who is still at school has been the head of her family since November, 2015.

She looks after her blind grandmother and her two younger siblings; one aged 10 (girl) while the other is a boy aged eight.

It is said their father a 40-yearold man, left them in 2009 under the pretence that he was going to buy bread at a local shop, but he never returned home.

This newspaper understands that the mother of all three children also left, under the guise that she was going to fend for them in 2010, after her husband and the father of the children disappeared.

Visits

It is said the three children know their mother's whereabouts, as she went to start a new family a few homesteads away from theirs and never visits the children claiming that they were cursed.

The area's headmen (bucopho) Dumsani Mahlindza confirmed the minors have been abandoned by both their parents and that the 13-year-old is now heading the

family. Mahlindza said the young girl was responsible for all her family members.

"The child still goes to school and struggles with her studies as she never rests.

This is becauses, after school, she has to nurse and help her grandmother by cooking, cleaning the homestead, washing clothes and going around begging for help from neighbours. The young boy wanted to drop out of school and become a bus conductor but was advised against that, thus he is still at school," the headman said.

He said the minors would sometimes ask their school cooker not to throw away any of the leftovers as they would be used by the minors as supper.

"When schools are closed it is hard for us to get food, at times we visit our mother to ask for food," the 13-year-old minor said.

Prayer

The minors' grandmother Gogo Solani Dlamini said as a family, they survived by God's grace adding that every midnight, they would woke up to pray that things would get better.

"The children wake up daily and go to school, we wake up every night to pray that the curse that is on the family disappears. We just want the children's parents back so that they live normal children's life, as things are now, they are faced with many struggles," she said.

On that note, Indvuna of the area, Zizwe Mamba, said the father of the children was believed to be in South Africa, either dead or in jail.

Mamba expressed his displeasure at the grandmother who feared doing an operation as Good Shepherd hospital.

It is said the old woman refused to have the operation done in fear of losing her life in the process.

Mamba further stated that the mother of the minors has been contacted several times by the community, but she refused to attend to her children.

Oslo pupils back in class

Court stops disciplinary hearing of STAWU Leader

THE Industrial Court has issued an interim order interdicting a disciplinary hearing of Swaziland Transport and Allied Workers Union (STAWU) Deputy President General Thulani Reginald Dlamini from proceeding.

The matter appeared before Justice Dumisani Mazibuko.

STAWU instituted court proceedings on a certificate of urgency, upon learning that the disciplinary process, which commenced on August 2nd 2016 was punctuated with all indicators of being a sham.

The matter returns to court for a call on August 17th.

The disciplinary hearing commenced days after which Dlamini had filed litigation papers against his employer [Chrisilda Transport].

At the heart of the said litigation was failure by the company to comply with the Regulation of Wages (Road Transportation)
Industry Order of 2013.

Dlamini is a renowned worker rights activist.

On December 2015 at

"They are currently camping at the site and doing the foundation in readiness for the slab.



CORPORATE Social Responsibility (CSR) which is also called: corporate conscience, corporate citizenship or responsible business, is a form of corporate self-regulation integrated into a business model.

CSR policy functions as a self-regulatory mechanism whereby a business monitors and ensures its active compliance with the spirit of the law, ethical standards and national or international norms. With some models, a firm's implementation of CSR goes beyond compliance and engages in "actions that appear to further some social good, beyond the interests of the firm and that which is required by law.

CSR aims to embrace responsibility for corporate actions and to encourage a positive impact on the environment and stakeholders including consumers, employees, investors, communities, and others.

■ THE TERM "CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY" became popular in the 1960s and has been used indiscriminately by many to cover legal

and moral responsibility more narrowly construed. Proponents argue that corporations increase long-term profits by operating with a CSR perspective, while critics argue that CSR distracts from business' economic

A study made in the early years of this 21st century, compared existing econometric studies of the relationship between social and financial performance, concluding that the contradictory results of previous studies reporting positive, negative, and neutral financial impact, were due to flawed empirical analysis and claimed when the study is properly specified, CSR has a neutral impact on financial outcomes of companies.

Some people or critics questioned the "lofty" and sometimes "unrealistic expectations" in CSR or that CSR is merely window-dressing, or an

attempt to pre-empt the role of governments as a watchdog over powerful multinational corporations but that applies to mostly developed countries.

Some sociologists viewed CSR as a form of capitalist legitimacy and in particular point out that what began as a social movement against uninhibited corporate power was transformed by corporations into a 'business model' and a 'risk management' device, often with questionable results, hence my writing this article, is in the interest of discussing CSR in the African or rather Swaziland perspective.

THE VIEW OF ORGANISATIONS

CSR is titled to aid an organisation's mission as well as a guide to what the company stands for its consumers. Business ethics is the part of applied ethics that examines ethical principles and moral or ethical problems that can arise in a business environment, hence the ISO standards which is an international standard on CSR.

ISO 26000 is the recognised international standard for CSR.

Some organisations tend to, for example, adhere to the triple bottom line reporting when it comes to CSR issues. The Triple Bottom Line (TBL) refers to: people, planet and profit, People refers to fair labour practices, the community and region where the business operates, planet refers to sustainable environmental practices, Profit is the economic value created by the organisation after deducting the cost of all inputs, including the cost of the capital.

DEFINING CSR

Corporate Social Responsibility is defined as "a company's sense of responsibility towards the community and environment (both ecological and social) in which it operates. Companies express this citizenship through one or all of the three ways, which are: through their waste and pollution reduction processes, contributing educational and social programs and by earning adequate

returns on the employed resources. A broader definition of CSR expands from a focus on stakeholders to include volunteering.

CONSUMER PERSPECTIVE ON CSR

Most consumers agree that while achieving business targets, companies should do CSR at the same time. Most consumers believe companies doing charity will receive a positive response from the environment in which it operates.

Somerville (2009) states that consumers are loyal and willing to spend more on retailers that support charity as compared to those that do not. Consumers also believe that retailers selling local products will gain loyalty. Smith (2013) shares the belief that marketing local products will gain consumer trust.

However, environmental efforts are receiving negative views given the belief that this would affect customer service. Becker-Olsen (2006) found that if the social initiative done by the company is not aligned with other

company goals it will have a negative impact. Mohr et al. (2001) emphasises the importance of reaching the consumer when engaging in CSR.

The scope of CSR emphasised the official behaviour of individual firms. Later, it expanded to include supplier behaviour and the uses to which products were put and how they were disposed of after they lost value.

ETHICS TRAINING

The rise of ethics training inside organisations, some of it required by government regulation, has helped CSR to spread. The aim of such training is to help employees make ethical decisions when the answers are unclear.

The most direct benefit is reducing the likelihood of "dirty hands fines" and damaged reputations for breaching laws or moral norms.

Organisations see increased employee loyalty and pride in the organisation that takes SCR as an important part of the organisation's engagement.

The most common CSR actions includes

Environmental sustainability: recycling, waste management, water management, renewable energy, reusable materials, 'greener' supply chains, reducing paper use and adopting Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) building standards.

Community involvement: This can include raising money for local charities, providing volunteers, sponsoring local events, employing local workers, supporting local economic growth, engaging in fair trade practices, etc.

Ethical marketing: Companies that ethically market to consumers are placing a higher value on their customers and respecting them as people who are ends in themselves. They do not try to manipulate or falsely advertise to potential consumers This is important for comnies that want to be viewed as ethical.

South African politics is at a crossroads

FOR the first time, in the history of our electoral democracy, the governing liberation movement, that came to power through Joe Slovo's "Sunset Clause," faces its own sunset as a party of choice.

The African National Congress (ANC) has experienced declines in the polls since the 2009 National and Provincial Elections, but nothing as seismic as this once glorious movement being shaken to the core by not achieving above 50% in four Metropolitan Municipalities (Nelson Mandela Bay, Tshwane, Johannesburg, and Ekurhuleni). Even bookmakers were never ready.

Whilst the ANC is declining, there is no opposition party that has grown enough to be an outright majority winner and lead any of the councils without needing assistance from another political party. Suddenly, the big talk in town is "The Big C" – coalitions. South Africa is not new to coalitions, even amongst the most

unlikely and least expected bedfellows. At the dawn of our democracy in 1994, the Inkatha Freedom Party (IFP) led a coalition government with the ANC – its arch nemesis – in KwaZulu-Natal. In 2004 the ANC led a coalition government with the New National Party – NNP – (which was a revamped National Party) in the Western Cape Province.

THE EFF DILEMMA

Besides Nelson Mandela Bay, there seems to be a coalition divide of either the ANC-EFF or the DA-EFF teaming up together.

The common denominator is the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF). Given that voters have shrunk the ANC to below 50%, in a number of municipalities including Rustenburg the home of Marikana, it seems a vote of no confidence in the organisation and a desire for the party to go to a little corner (opposition benches) and stare at the wall as punishment. The EFF will no doubt be tempted to listen to both the ANC and the Democratic Alliance (DA) because politics is about the attainment of power to preside over

state resources. The EFF, without winning a municipality, has an opportunity to lead some municipalities because of the bargaining power it holds. Most likely, the EFF will take a national perspective in conducting its horse trading, as a way to come out a winner, but also deal with two fundamental dilemmas it faces.

THE DEMOCRATIC ALLIANCE CARDS

The DA, South Africa's electoral growth success story, may feel it has worked too hard to give in to the EFF's demands. No doubt the DA will not want to give any Mayorship to the EFF, because it will risk having the EFF strong arming the DA to agree to its policies and that being translated to electioneering propaganda on how the DA sees relevance in EFF policies. On the other hand the DA appears to have serious anxiety (uvalo) over EFF policies and thus would want to lock the EFF outside the levers of power. However, this is an impossible zero sum game, which will never win negotiations. (eNCA)



WHEN WOULD GHANA SEE AN END TO HUMAN TRAFFICKING

GHANA - I bring you warm greetings from Challenging Heights. I will like to start by acknowledging the fruitful partnership that exists between Challenging Heights and your ministry.

Through our collative efforts over 40 000 Ghanaian children are going to benefit from free shoes distribution along the coastal areas of Ghana, thanks to Tom Shoes.

This letter promises to be the longest I have ever written to you, so I hope you have 10 minutes to read through to the end. I planned this letter to be a little personal, touch your heart, and provoke you into action.

However knowing how charged our media landscape is, I fear that this letter could be leaked, and probably misinterpreted. I have therefore decided to direct the letter to your office, but also to copy the media, and some partners in this sector.

Thanks

Before I proceed, I will like to thank Ambassador Robert Jackson, the American Ambassador to Ghana, for acknowledging the work of Challenging Heights during the human trafficking symposium. Over the years, Challenging Heights has worked closely with the US State Department, the Canadian High Commission, the Australian High Commission, the British High Commission, and a host of other agencies in furthering our fight against child trafficking in Ghana.

Nana, Ghana's Human Trafficking Act, was passed in 2005. It took us over 10 years to pass a Legislative Instrument (LI). Following the creation of the Human Trafficking Act, I am disappointed that it appears the Ghana Government has been setting up the consequential Human Trafficking board to fail.

We established the Human Trafficking Fund, and put in only GHC100 000, and for nearly a

decade no other money has been lodged into the fund. This is not only disappointing, but heartbreaking as well.

I love the warning issued by the American government, that if Ghana does not take urgent steps to address the issue of human trafficking in Ghana, we will stand a chance of losing over 500million dollars in aid. It is my hope that other governments will pile similar pressure on Ghana, in order to do what we are supposed to do for our own citizens who fall victim to trafficking.

Nana I have been so disappointed, and sometimes I feel real pain, in our government handling of the issue of human trafficking in

It appears it is a non issue, and therefore government is unprepared to invest any of our tax money into addressing the issue.

Nearly every action that has taken place has been because some donors have provided funding; from the Human Trafficking Act itself, to the LI, to training of the security agencies, to nearly everything. Practical actions, rescuing victims have nearly remained the effort of civil society organisations.

Although we have enacted laws, set up structures, and taken some actions, it appears to me that a lot of government officials either do not believe that human trafficking exists, or they do not believe that human trafficking is a crime.

I recall that a few years ago, an MP from Sege publicly condemned the police for intercepting a truck load of children who were being sent to Lake Volta for the purposes of labour exploitation.

Threatened

Just a few months ago, the DCE of Awutu Senya threatened to arrest me if my organisation. Challenging Heights, went ahead to rescue vulnerable children at risk of being trafficked to Lake Volta.

Human trafficking is an international issue, which is currently engaging the attention of every country, including the West. In the last couple of years, there is hardly a month that passes by without the US State Department being involved in one discussion or the other on human trafficking.

The President of America, Barrack Obama, has made human trafficking and morden slavery one of his key focus areas, and regularly makes comments on the issue. Here in Ghana there is a deafening silence on the issue throughout our governance system. The President of Ghana, John Mahama hardly identifies with the issue.

Nana, trust me, children are being sold and bought for as little as GHC100 for purposes of labour exploitation, and this is happening right here in Ghana. On Lake Volta we have boys and girls, some as young as six years, working day and night, some working between the hours of 3am and 8pm.

They cast nets, paddle canoes, play outboard motors, mend nets, remove fishes, and dive deep into the lake to remove trapped nets. We have girls who have been thrown into perpetual servitude, and they serve as sex materials for men who work for older child victims, in addition to working as fishmongers and cooks.

We have boys and girls who are oiling the wheels of Ghana's economy at the expense of their freedom, education, health, development, and future.

We have children who have resigned into believing that it is okay to torture children.

Above all, we have boys and girls who are living disposable lives. These children die needless unreported deaths, some through work related risks, others through work torture, while still others die as a result of neglect. Nana, I'm referring to thousands of children trapped in oblivion. A couple of weeks ago when we collaborated with the police to rescue those four boys who were sold for GHC125 each, we had a bonus child who had been in slavery for five years. Does this tell you anything about the situation? Oftentimes I look at your ministry's budget and I don't see enough financial commitment. Your budget does not give me any hope that we will be able to address this issue sooner.

THE Municipal Council of Manzini is owed over E60 million in rates.

Public Relations Officer Mathokoza Thwala

said this affected service delivery of the Council hence stalled overall development of the country's hub.

"The amount of money received through rates payment determines the quality of service that can be rendered to the public. Therefore, if the Council receives 50 percent of the total rates payment, consequently, the service we can provide to the public also slows down. MOTORITS should not worry about the continued strike by the Chemical, Energy, Paper, Printing, Wood and Allied Workers' Union (CEPPWAWU) which has affected the delivery of oil.

A senior government official said the department of energy under the ministry of natural resources and energy was monitoring the situation very closely.

"We are in constant communication with petrol suppliers in South Africa to ensure there is no petrol shortage.

"We communicate daily with petrol suppliers and also with retailers," he said.

The source said currently the strike has had a minimal impact on motorists as the petrol supplies have not been disrupted.

The order book is being filled on a dayto-day basis so motorists should not be overly concerned about the strike in South Africa.

"Even if the supply from South Africa should be disrupted, the alternative would be to source petrol in Mozambique," he

The senior official added that some petrol retailers already import petrol from Mozambique and therefore any problems encountered in South Africa would have no major impact.

Reports from Business Report said 15 000 workers aligned to CEPPWAWU went on strike on July 28 after a deadlock in wage talks with the National Petroleum Employers' Association (NPEA). The union wants a one-year nine percent increase, while NPEA offered seven percent in the first year and an increase linked to next April's consumer price index plus 1.5 percent in year two.

"The strike has led to fuel shortages at certain stations. Gauteng was the hardest hit, with 10 percent of stations running dry," Business Report reported.

A previous strike by CEPPWAWU in 2011 affected refineries, although they continued to operate. Hundreds of fuel stations, however, ran dry as the bargaining sector also covers fuel tank drivers and depot

THE Micro Finance Unit will conduct a survey to assess the performance of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSME) in Swaziland.

The survey, to be conducted between this month and October would also assess the sector's contribution to gross domestic product, employment and exports, as well as indentify key drivers and the constraining factors of the sector.

In a statement, MFU said the survey would also inform the monitoring and evaluation framework of

the country's financial inclusion

"The MSME Finsorpe Swaziland 2016 will interview a sample of 3 000 households with a business from a total of 405 enumerating areas across the country, of which 309 will be in the rural communities."

IPSOS South Africa, a research house, has been engaged to conduct the survey. A steering committee comprising of MFU, the Small and Medium Enterprise Unit, Small Enterprises Development Company, Central Bank of Swaziland, and the Central Statistics Office was established to

guide implementation of the survey, whilst FinMark Trust South Africa would provide technical advice.

The findings of the survey would help the country establish the business coverage of the MSMEs, segmentation and market concentration, share contribution to GDP, employment and exports and the financial coverage."

MFU said although the Swaziland Poverty Reduction Strategy and Action Plan (PRASP) recognised the SME sector as one of the key pillars supporting growth of the economy, the lack of information on the performance of the sector remained a constraining factor to the financial institutions that should extend services and policymakers to improve the environment.

Therefore the organisation said financial services could help foster an economic growth through promoting the development of a supportive infrastructure and systems that would ease access to credit for a well-prepared MSME sector to contribute to economic growth, employment creation and exports.

"Improved access to finance is regarded pro-growth and also means to reduce income inequality and poverty," said MFU.

SADC member states to work together to promote tourism

THE Southern African Development Committee (SADC) committee of ministers, responsible for tourism, have recognised the need for SADC member states to work as a collective for the promotion of tourism in the region.

This recognition was expressed during the seventh meeting of SADC ministers responsible for tourism recently held in Gaborone, Botswana.

The meeting was hosted by the government of Botswana.

According to a statement by the SADC Secretariat, the meeting was called to review the progress made on the implementation of the regional tourism programme in the SADC region and the exchange of views on topical issues relating to or impacting on tourism in the SADC region.

"The meeting also took the opportunity to review the outcomes of the mandate, the Ministers had given to the Board of the Regional Tourism Organisation of Southern Africa (RETOSA), to transform RETOSA into a viable organisation, that coordinates the regional tourism issues in the region; ensuring that it is not only sustainable, but adds the much needed value to the SADC tourism sector," said SADC.

"RETOSA constituted an appropriate vehicle for the region to achieve this objective, with the support of the SADC Secretariat, addressing the regional tourism policy and legislative harmonisation," reads the statement as part

Capacity

The SADC Secretariat reported that SADC ministers also appealed to council to ensure that there was adequate capacity at the Secretariat to coordinate and address issues of regional tourism coordination within the framework of the on-going restructuring of the SADC Secretariat.

The ministers also directed the RETOSA board to review the RETOSA Charter and the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between SADC Secretariat and RETOSA, and align them to the revised structure and mandate of the organisation and any other imperatives.

The secretariat revealed that the meeting received a presentation from a representative of the Caribbean Tourism Organisation (CTO), Ms Carol Hay, on its strategy in promoting, championing and coordinating the tourism industry in the Caribbean States, with the objective of benchmarking RETOSA with other similar regional entities around the world.

"The meeting also received a report from the RETOSA Board on the revised mandate of RETOSA, its revised organisational structure and road map towards implementation of the Ministers decision to resuscitate RETOSA. The organisational structure shall commence with a lean structure, which will grow to the ultimate approved. structure over time, on a phased basis," reads the statement as part.

The statement said the meeting was attended by Ministers and Deputy Ministers from Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Mozambique, Namibia and Zimbabwe. The other countries were represented by Permanent Secretaries/Director Generals and Senior Officials.

SNHB DOES NOT HAVE ENOUGH LAND INVENTORY

THE Swaziland National Housing Board (SNHB) does not have sufficient inventory of land especially in the Mbabane-Manzini corridor, where significant urbanisation is experienced.

This observation was made by a study undertaken by Setsabile Nhlabatsi and Cliff Dlamini. which appeared in the American Journal of Economics, Finance and Management, titled 'Enabling the Affordable Housing Mandate: The Case of the Swaziland National Housing Board.'

Institution

"The institution first has to buy the land from private property owners, at market rates, before it can incur development costs," the study observed.

Though the organisation receives ad hoc parcels of land from government, the study revealed that the impact on property prices has not been evident as the plot prices are still as high as those of private developers. The reason was found to be the high input costs.

"For instance the input costs

include the development and borrowing costs charged by the development contractors and commercial banks respectively," reads the journal as part.


Another challenge faced by the institution, the study noted, was the insufficient financial resources available for property development. Loans

"The organisation uses commercial bank loans to finance its housing developments and pledges some of the owned properties as security.

"It does not receive subvention from government, despite the mandate to charge below market rates and the formation of the institution is such that annual rental escalation rates are determined by the Public Enterprise Unit (PEU), in consultation with Cabinet," the study noted.

The researchers highlighted the fact that SNHB manages rental units that are more than 26 years old having been handed over by government in 1988.

"These units have outdated infrastructure and are due a major refurbishment especially plumbing and electrical works. They are now a high mainte-



cost, which cannot be covered by the sub-market rental charge," the study

The study surmised that faced with the challenge of shortage of funds, the SNHB therefore resorts to reactive maintenance and repairing broken equipment as opposed to replacing it with new ones.

"Some revenue is also lost as some of the older units are declared by the local authority as unfit for human occupation and have to be demolished," the study said.

The study further uncovered the issue that the SNHB's remuneration package was not competitive and that has resulted in high staff turnover and loss of critical skills.

"The institution spends a lot of time training new employees on internal systems and procedures and developing them to perform at their best. Due to the controlled salaries, the institution is however not able to retain its employees, as they quickly leave for better paying companies," reads the journal as part. Study

The study revealed that the general understanding of the affordable housing mandate is that SNHB should provide housing that is priced at below market rates.

The study indicates that even though the country had an objective to provide below market rate housing, there was no proper foresight as to how that was going to be possible in the longer term without subvention.

"The rental stock handed over to the institution ages and needs refurbishment but the rental collections are not sufficient to cover the maintenance and management costs," the study noted.

WOOLWORTHS TO SPEND **R2.1BN ON SYDNEY SUPERSTORE**



CAPE TOWN - Woolworths yesterday outlined plans to spend up to R2.1-billion on a "world-class" department store on 11 levels for its Australian subsidiary David

The South African retail group said it had sold its Market Street property in Sydney to Australia's Scentre Group for A\$360-million (R3.8-billion) and would be using up to A\$200-million (R2.1-billion) of the proceeds to develop the adjacent Elizabeth Street building to offer "the best of fashion and food available in the southern hemisphere".

Limited

The group said a three-year leaseback of the Market Street building would ensure limited disruption to David Jones' customers. The rede-

velopment is expected to be completed in the second half of 2019.

In September last year, Woolworths appointed John Dixon, who led the turnaround of Marks & Spencer's £5-billion food business, as chief executive officer of David Jones, the iconic Australian department store chain it bought in August of 2014.

Woolworths added that the David Jones head office, currently housed in the two Sydney buildings, would be relocated to Melbourne and consolidated in a new campus with the group's other Australian subsidiary, Country Road Group.

The company said it expected synergies and productivity benefits of at least A\$10-million per annum from 2019.

Sasol reports slight decline in sales of petrol and diesel

JOHANNESBURG - Sasol's (SOL) sales of petrol and diesel - what it refers to as "white product liquid fuel" declined a fraction to 58.8-million barrels in the year to end-June from 59.2-million the previous year.

Its total fuel sales include "black product" - chemicals like bitumen which is used to make tar — which grew to 2.5million barrels from 2.3-million barrels, the group said in a production update on Friday ahead of its financial results scheduled for release on September 12.


Total liquid fuel sales of 61.3-million barrels were 2% higher than the forecast given in its interim results. Sasol's Secunda synfuel plant increased production by 1% to 33.2-million barrels and its Natref refinery by 1.4% to 21.2-million

Its Oryx gas-to-liquid plant in Qatar reported a 9.4% drop in production to 4.72-million barrels, which the company said was due to an extended planned statutory shutdown in the third quarter of Sasol's financial year.

"Subsequent to the shutdown, utilisation rates averaged above 100% of nameplate capacity. The financial year's utilisation rate of 81% is in line with our previous market guidance" Sasol said.

Canadian natural gas production fell 5% to 20.7-billion standard cubic feet while Mozambican gas production rose 4.8% to 114.4-billion standard cubic feet. iNet Bridge

Union lambastes contractors as petrol strike drags on

JOHANNESBURG - Independent contractors delivering fuel to petrol stations as part of the contingency plan to prevent them from running dry could be paid thousands of rands, according to a union representative.

Clement Chitja, head of collective bargaining at the Chemical Energy Paper Printing Wood and Allied Workers Union (Ceppwawu), told Fin24 that independent contractors are paid by delivery for their services, as opposed to the hourly rate members are paid.

"One delivery by contractors could be up to R12 000, whether the delivery was completed in an hour or not," said Chitja. Members are paid R98 per hour, he said. The petrol strike, which started on July 28, is entering its second week. An agreement between unions and employers could not be reached at a meeting held last week.

There is a possibility that unions will meet again with the National Petroleum Employers' Association (NPEA) at some point, said Zimisele Majamane, deputy chair of the NPEA.

SKOM WORKERS STRIKE OVER PAY

JOHANNESBURG - The **National Union of** Mineworkers said yesteday that 10% of its 15 000 members at Eskom had embarked on a strike after wage negotiations failed.

Paris Mashego, the union's Eskom energy sector coordinator, said members had downed tools at Thuthuka, Matla, Dover and Arnot power stations, but warned about the possibility of a full-blown

strike come tomorrow. Eskom spokesman Khulu Pasiwe said employees were not supposed to go on strike as the power utility was classified as an essential service.

'The normal human resource processes are going to unfold for people involved in the unprotected strike," said Pasiwe.

Eskom received reports at 2am yesteday that a road leading to Arnot power station in

Mpumalanga had been blocked. Pasiwe said police had unblocked the road and brought the situation under control.

"People who are meant to go to work are at work. All 27 power stations are operating as per normal at this stage."

Eskom is concerned about staff working on late shifts. "When people go on strike, they sometimes intimidate others. Timeslive

Hacked bitcoin exchange users lose 36% of deposits

TOKYO - Hong Kong-based Bitfinex said all users will lose 36% of their deposits after the bitcoin exchange concluded its review of a \$71m hacking attack.

CHAD PRESIDENT SET TO BE SWORN IN FOR FIFTH TERM

N'DJAMENA – Chad's President Idriss Deby was set to be sworn in yesterday for a fifth term in power, facing persistent resistance from an opposition that alleges his reelection was a "political holdup".

Heavily-armed security forces cracked down at the weekend, using tear gas to disperse opposition activists who rallied despite an official ban in the poor, landlocked nation.

One young protester was shot dead on Sunday, opposition and police sources said.

"We are in the right. It's the government that is acting illegally by preventing political parties from expressing themselves," Saleh Kebzabo, Deby's nearest rival in the April presidential vote, said on Saturday.

On Friday opposition activists announced they had filed a complaint in court alleging high treason against Deby, saying he attempted the "illegal taking of power by violence" and "misuse of public money". Deby came to power in 1990 and was re-elected in a first round vote in April with 61,5 percent of ballots cast against 12,8 percent for Kebzabo, according to official results.

The opposition called Deby's re-election a "political hold-up", saying their own count showed no candidate won outright at the first stage. The election campaign was marred by a clampdown on demonstrations by unions and rights groups demanding a change of leadership and democratic reforms.

Arrests and disappearances of activists are common in the nation of 12-million.

The situation in the oil-producing semi-desert country, a key player in the fight against west African jihadist groups, has been tense in recent months.





More than 50 million people living in 17 conflict-ridden countries are in 'severe food insecurity", two UN agencies warned recently. The protracted conflicts in Yemen and Syria place those two nations at the top of the list established by the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) and the World Food Programme (WFP). In Yemen, 14 million people - over half the population are now considered to be facing a food crisis or emergency. AFP

A total of 28 died in central Puebla State, at least 15 of them minors, as landslides buried several houses, the state government said. The other 10 died in similar circumstances in the eastern state of Veracruz, its governor said. In the town of Huauchin-ango, the amount of rain that normally falls in a month came pouring down in just 24 hours. the Puebla government said. A hill crumbled and came sweeping down on an adjacent village, killing 11 people including eight minors, it said. AFP

Portuguese minister mugged in Rio

RIO DE JANEIRO – Portugal's education minister has been mugged in an upscale Rio district, media reports and police in the Olympics host city said Sunday. The tourist division of the civil police said in a statement that "a minister of a foreign state" was attacked Saturday in Ipanema. A 26-year-old man was arrested along the beach front and the victim's belongings were returned to him, the statement said. AFP

SCORES KILLED IN SW PAKISTAN HOSPITAL BL

QUETTA - At least 20 people were killed and dozens more wounded after a blast at a major hospital in the Pakistani city of Quetta, an AFP reporter and officials said, with fears the toll could rise.

Graphic video footage from the scene showed bodies strewn on the ground, some still smoking, among pools of blood and shattered glass as shocked survivors cried and comforted one another.

A large burn mark against white brick appeared to indicate where the explosion occurred. The blast came after mourners including

journalists and lawyers gathered at the hospital following the fatal shooting of a senior local lawyer, officials said. Many of the dead appeared to be wearing black suits and ties.

"More than 20 people have been killed, including two cameramen in the blast," said Daud Khilji, a senior administration official in Quetta. The figure was confirmed by an AFP reporter on the scene and senior police official Akbar Raisani, who said at least 40 others had been wounded. A number of lawyers and some journalists had gathered at the hospital following


the death of the president of the Balochistan Bar Association in a separate shooting incident early this morning," Akbar Harifal, the home secretary of restive Balochistan province where the explosion occurred, told AFP.

The lawyer, Bilal Anwar Kasi, was targeted by two unknown gunmen as he left his home in the morning for work. There were no immediate claims of responsibility for either attack. Balochistan, which borders Iran and Afghanistan, has oil and gas resources but is afflicted by Islamist militancy, sectarian vio-

Japan's emperor hints at abdication

TOKYO - Japanese Emperor Akihito said yesterday he is concerned his weakening health may make it hard to fulfil his duties, in a speech seen as flagging a possible future abdication.

"I am worried that it may become difficult for me to carry out my duties as the symbol of the state with my whole being as I have done until now," he said in an address to the nation.

"There are times when I feel various constraints such as in my physical fitness," the 82-year-old said.

Akihito spoke obliquely, but the government is expected to interpret his comments as meaning his wish is to eventually step down. It can then begin creating the necessary legal mechanism which currently does not exist.

Prime Minister Shinzo Abe in a swift response to the emperor's speech said the government would take the emperor's remarks "serious-

"Considering the emperor's duties, as well as his age and the burden (of the job), we have to firmly look at what

we can do." Speculation about the emperor's future emerged last month with reports he had told confidantes that advancing age was making it harder to perform his ceremonial duties and that he would like to step down in a few years.

The address marked only the second time for Akihito to speak directly to the nation, the first having been in the days after the March 2011 triple earthquake, tsunami and nuclear disaster as he sought to calm a nation undergoing its worst crisis since the war. AFP

Cuba blames US for surge in unsafe migration

HAVANA - Cuba has blamed the United States for encouraging illegal and unsafe immigration by tens of thousands of Cubans who have left the country in the past two years.

Havana released a statement on Sunday saying Cubans leaving the country illegally were the "victims of the politicisation of the migration issue by the US government which stimulates illegal and unsafe immigration", Reuters news agency reported.

The US policy of welcoming Cubans without visas contradicted normalisation efforts between Havana and Washington, the statement added.

More than 46 500 Cubans arrived and were admitted to the US without visas during the first 10 months of the US government's fiscal year 2016, according to the Pew Research Centre. That figure compares with more than 43 000 Cubans in 2015 and just over 24 000 in 2014.

Unlike citizens of other countries, Cubans who make it to US borders have special entry privileges under the Cold War-era Cuban Adjustment Act, which gives Cuban citizens special welfare benefits and allows them to apply for permanent residency after 366 days in the country. Under the act, Cuban who set foot on US territory are treated as legal immigrants, while people from any other country are considered illegal.

The large increase in the number of Cubans attempting to reach the US, particularly by overland routes through South and Central America, coincides with the restoration of diplomatic relations between Washington and Havana. There are fears among ordinary Cubans that diplomatic normalisation between Havana and Washington will mean they lose their privileged entry status to the US. Regional governments have also responded to the increase in Cubans travelling overland to the US by closing down border routes. Nicaragua was the first country to close its borders in November to Cubans travelling overland to Mexico and on to the US. News24

As the copyright act has been passed in the House of Assembly, SWAMA Public Relations Officer Menzi Mtsetfwa affirmed, "we believe it is not encouraging when our hardworking artists are paid a mere E6 000 for performances they have dripped blood and sweat over. That amount only caters for the per-

formance nitty gritty's as our artists deliver nothing but the best on stage" he added.

Afro- Soul sensation, Sands has confirmed that he and his management have reached agreements with SIPA management for him to perform at the trade fair. "My manager Tom Churchyard

informed me that I am scheduled for the trade fair and I am thrilled with this news" he said.

Airplay

The artist whose music has been receiving airplay on various South African media stations; including Mzansi Magic's soapie series 'Isibaya', said he would not be able to disclose his performance fee. As those were merely management issues but invited the public to come in numbers as he will be singing their favourite songs.

Other artists, who are likely to be on the list are rapper King Kangaroo, Chakalaka, Mshikishi and Tribal Misfits. Although the final list has not been compiled yet, Mtsetfwa confirmed that only 10 artists who will make the cut. DJs and dancers included.

SERENA, VENUS LOSE FIRST EVER OLYMPIC DOUBLES MATCH

RIO DE JANERIO - Serena and Venus Williams lost an Olympic doubles match for the first time, as they were stunned in the opening round of Rio 2016 by the Czech Republic's Lucie Safarova and Barbora Strycova 6-3, 6-4.

The Williams sisters entered Sunday's match with a 15-0 career record in the Olympics, winning the gold medal in women's doubles every time they entered the event in 2000, 2008 and 2012.

The American duo were top seeds in Rio and coming off a 14th Grand Slam championship together at Wimbledon a month ago, but are heading home early.

Neither Safarova nor Strycova, meanwhile, had ever won an Olympic doubles match, going a combined 0-3 with other partners. They are unseeded in Rio.

They weren't even supposed to be playing together at the Olympics. Strycova was a late replacement for Karolina Pliskova, who withdrew from the tournament.

Indeed, Strycova and Safarova

had only played one match as a team before Sunday night - and they lost that, in a Fed Cup match last year.



Surfing's 1st world champion, Farrelly, dies

SYDNEY - Bernard "Midget" Farrelly, who won surfing's first world championship and was a pioneering surfboard designer, has died aged 71, Surfing Australia confirmed yesterday.

Farrelly became the first Australian to win a major surfing title when he won the Makaha Invitational in Hawaii in 1963. He won the first official world championship off Sydney's Manly beach the following year and was world championship runner-up in 1968 and

Midget

Surfing Australia said Farrelly, known as Midget for his diminutive stature - he stood 170cm and weighed 66kg - was Australia's first surfing superstar.

He was a supreme stylist who "possessed an elegance and positioning superior to other surfers of his time."

Farrelly's success boosted surfboard sales in Australia and he became an influential designer of short boards.



DJOKOVIC IN TEARS AFTER LOSING TO JUAN MARTIN DEL POTRO

RIO DE JANEIRO - World NO. 1 Novak Djokovic crashed out of the Olympic men's singles in the first round, losing in straight sets to Argentina's Juan Martin Del Potro in a defeat he called 'one of the toughest' of his life.

Djokovic, who also lost to Del Potro in the bronze medal play-off in London in 2012, had no answer to the power of the 2009 US Open champion, who sealed a 7-6, 7-6 victory in almost two and a half hours.

The 27-year-old, who has dropped to 141st in the world after almost two years out with wrist problems, did not face a single break point on his serve and hammered 29 forehand winners past a helpless Djokovic.

An Olympic gold medal is the biggest prize missing from the Serbian's trophy cabinet after he finally won the French Open in June, becoming the first man in 47 years to hold all four grand slam titles at once. Djokovic's winning grand slam run

came to an end with a shock thirdround loss to Sam Querrey at Wimbledon, but the 29-year-old had bounced back by claiming his 30th Masters title in Toronto last week and was a hot favourite in Rio. He was visibly emotional as he left the court in Rio after defeat, departing in tears following his surprise defeat to Del Potro.

"No doubt this is one of the toughest losses in my life and in my career" he said afterwards. "It's not easy to handle, especially now, just after the wounds are still fresh.

'But, you know, you have to deal with it. It's not the first or the last time that I have lost a tennis match. But the Olympic Games, yeah, it's completely different.

"Delpo was the better player and he just deserved to win. That's sport. He just came up with some extraordinary tennis and I have to congratulate him.

"I'm very sad and disappointed from my side to go out in a tournament this early, but on the other hand I'm glad a good friend of mine, and somebody who has struggled the last couple of years with injuries, is back and playing at this level."

RIO DE JANEIRO - Team USA's triumphant performance in the pool in the 4x100m relay had Americans across the world cheering, but the moment was all too much for swimmer Ryan Held when he stepped onto the podium.

Held, who swam the third leg in the race, broke down in tears as he was presented with his gold medal alongside Michael Phelps, Caeleb Dressel, and Nathan Adrian.

The 21-year-old from Springfield, Illinois, struggled to hide his emotions as the Star-Spangled Banner played throughout the area.

When the US flag was hoisted to the rafters, he placed his head in his hand and wept with joy. Incredible photos show the moment Held was overcome with emotion, and also the heartwarming reaction of his teammates who were quick to throw their arms around him and celebrate to put a smile back on his face.

"I didn't think I was going to cry. I was too tired to cry, I didn't think I could cry," Held said.
"I've heard the national

"I've heard the national anthem hundreds of times, but

as soon as that played it was just something different. The tears just started rolling down my face."

On the stroll around the deck, gold medals slung around their necks, Dressel lost it, too. He brought his right arm across his face to wipe away tears.

"They were making us cry," said Phelps, who had a tear roll down his cheek while posing for photographers.

Adrian smiled as he comforted his younger teammates.

"I love a little emotion," he said. "I had to fight back some tears myself." Phelps had counseled Dressel and Held ahead of time that it was OK to sing and cry on the medal stand.

"It's good to see the emotion of those young guys. It shows they really do care and they love what they're doing," said Phelps, who earned his record 19th Olympic gold medal.

Held marvelled at his good fortune to have helped add to Phelps' glittering collection.

"Holy cow, it's unreal, unbelievable," he said. "To be with him and to be teammates on his last hoorah, it's amazing."

Annemiek van Vleuten ok after high-speed crash

RIO DE JANEIRO - Van Vleuten, 33, had pulled clear with 10km to go, but came off her bike on a sharp turn while travelling at speed down the Vista Chinesa descent.

She lay motionless while help arrived. Cycling's governing body, the International Cycling Union, said she "continues to be under examination" but has "no serious medical problem". She was diagnosed as having severe concussion and three small fractures in her lower back and was admitted to intensive care for 24 hours. On Saturday, Italy's Vincenzo Nibali broke a collar bone when he crashed on the same descent while leading the men's race. Former Olympic individual pursuit champion Chris Boardman told the BBC the course was dangerous.

"I am past commenting - I am angry about it," he said. "I went down and had a look at the course and saw those edges. We knew it was way past being technical; it was dangerous. The people who designed the course and said what safety features were needed had seen it as well and left it. "We knew the descent was treacherous. I looked at that road furniture and thought, nobody can crash here and just get up. It is really bad and that is what we have seen today."

The UCI said Van Vleuten was "conscious and could communicate" as she was taken to hospital following the crash. Her Netherlands team-mate Anna van der Breggen went on to win gold in three hours, 51 minutes and 27 seconds. Van der Breggen, asked about passing her stricken team-mate at the side of the road,





Wanderers making a tendency to hire unqualified coaches

IT happened with Zimbabwean mentor Shepherd Murape and we gave Manzini Wanderers a benefit of the doubt but the same blunder has once again occurred.

Wanderers are making a bad habit of hiring ineligible coaches, who do not have the right qualifications to take charge of a Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) team in the country.

The National Football
Associations (NFAS) made it clear that for any coach to be eligible to lead a PLS team, he has to hold a CAF Licence B and this message was loud and clear. But Wanderers went for yet another Zimbabwean coach in Julius Chakupewa, who was hired a few weeks ago and astonishingly, the team was once again making headlines for the same error. He too, just like Murape, did not have the proper qualifications demanded by the

FA. I do not want to believe the team's management is ignorant of the FA's demands but their actions are proving my sense of doubt wrong. They seem to be so keen on their desire to have a foreign coach taking over the team so much they choose to go against the association's governing rules.

Screening

If the team was abiding to the FA requirement, they would take careful consideration when screening and hiring a coach, making sure that he meets the obligation. It's not doing the brand any good.

After training the team, leading to the Charity Cup, the coach could only watch from the stands and I think that disturbed the team somehow. This is one area the team should work on, get suitable qualified coaches.

On a positive note though, it makes so much sense as to why the team opts for the coaches that they go for. Murape's arrival at Wanderers brought a glimpse of hope for a team that was destined for the wilderness. The situation was so bad that an unbeaten streak in four games earned Murape

the status of a
Messiah. The team

better even after
his departure and
finished in the top
eight. Julius came
along and within a
month, he built a
team capable of
ending a decade of

"The executive is yet to discuss matters pertaining to the Charity Cup and I am not in a position to commit myself any further until the meeting takes place," he said.


Manzini Wanderers General Manager, Patrick Gamedze, said they were yet to be informed about the matter, when contacted yesterday.
