PRIME Minister Sibusiso Dlamini left the country for Uganda yesterday, where he will be representing His Majesty the King during President Yoweri

The Prime Minister left for Kampala with the Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation Chief Mgwagwa Gamedze through Ngwenya-Oshoek border for South Africa where they will connect through

OR Tambo International Airport and are expected to return home over the weekend.

Speaking to the media, ministers and senior government officials the PM thanked the people who came to see him off.

"We are leaving for Uganda, Kampala to represent His Majesty

King Mswati III during President Yoweri Museveni's presidential swearing in on Thursday and we hope to travel well," he said.

Museveni has been the President of Uganda since 1986 and will be again swearing in for his next term in the office in Kampala, the country's capital.

KING APPOINTS SIFISO **KHUMALO DEPUTY AG**

Khumalo takes over from retired Sabelo Matsebula

HIS Majesty King Mswati III has appointed Sifiso Khumalo as the deputy attorney general with immediate effect.

The appointment was made on May 3, 2016, according to Legal Notice No, 83 of 2016. Khumall, the idvina of Ezulwini and also Rnowies and Mashampu was the principal crown counsel at the attorney general's office prior to the appointment.

He replaces Sabelo Matsebula, who left the position in December 2015 when he reached the mandatory retirement age of 60 years set for civil ser-

"In the exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 77 of the Constitution of Swaziland Act, 2005, I Mswati III, King and Ingwenyama of Swaziland, appoint Sifiso Mashampu Khumalo to be Deputy Attorney General of the Kingdom of Swaziland with immediate effect," read the gazette

The position had been left vacant until Khumalo was appointed on an acting basis in the last two months.

Khumalo boasts of 13 years practice experience as an admitted attorney and has handled a number of high profile cases for the state.

He was admitted to be legal practitioner in 2003 after serving as an articled clerk. He worked under the attorney general's office and was appointed principal crown Counsel in 2009 until his new appointment. He possesses an LLB Degree and is currently pursuing a Masters in private law.

Certificates

He also possesses various certificates in the field of law which included but not limited to a certificate in regulatory procedures attained from the centre for Parliamentary Studies in London and Construction Law.

He recently represented the state in a matter filed by the Swaziland Public Procurement Regulatory Agency (SPPRA), which wanted to set aside a process to purchase over 400 motor vehicles for different departments and ministries of government.

The agency argued that the process was in contravention of the Procurement Act of 2011 in that no open tendering was allowed.

However, Khumalo, on behalf of government, argued that the process was lawful and in line with the procurement regulations of 2008 since there were currently no regulations for the 2011

Act. He also argued that government was in dire need of a new fleet.

He further submitted, before High Court Judge Mumcy Dlamini, that the agency should first put its house in order and put in place the regulations.

Favour

The High Court ruled in favour of government and directed that the tendering process should go ahead because it was lawful. Judge Dlamini said government correctly used the 2008 regulations in the absence of the procurement regulations for the 2011 Public Procurement Act.

He also represented government in the contentious case of Mkhondvo against Malangeni Dlamini, who had been accused of taking the former's herd of cattle on suspicion that he had stolen some cows belonging to the King. Dlamini sent armed police officers to Maseko's kraal and they took the cattle.

Nude MP, judicial officer story was true - Times lawyer

LAWYERS representing The Times of Swaziland (PTY) LTD, Managing Editor Martin Dlamini and former reporter Mbongeni Ndlela argue that the article in which Matsanjeni North MP Phila Buthelezi and a judicial officer Cebsile Ngwenya were reported to have been found in bed was accurate and of public interest.

The Times of Swaziland is cocharged with Zwemart (PTY) LTD, a private investigation company and its employees with house breaking, robbery and crimen injuria.

The Times is facing two counts of defamation while Zwemart investigators face 10 counts of crimen injuria, robbery, house breaking with intent to commit the crime of crimen injuria, malicious damage to property, defamation and contravening the Criminal Procedure and Evidence

The charges faced by The Times state that (on counts eight and nine); the accused persons, either one or all of them, acting in furtherance of a common purpose, did wrongfully and

master of the High Court and Phila Buthelezi, a member of parliament while in their bedroom, When the charge sheet was read to the accused persons, they pleaded not guilty to all the charges.

It was at the moment that the crown called witnesses to prove commission of the crimes and Attorney B. Gamedze, who is representing The Times, made an application of a special plea before the court.

Gamedze said the defence counsel

was of the view that the prosecution should have stated in the charge sheet as to which part or statement on the article was defamatory.

Gamedze substantiated his argument by bringing forth the written statements that were made by the complainants at the police station.

The attorney said according to the statements, both complainants confirmed that they were indeed found in bed by the investigators.

Gamedze said according to the complainants' statements, the article was true and accurate. He said for this reason, the prosecution must, therefore single out the statements that are said to be defamatory in the

However, Crown Counsel Patrick Mkhatshwa said the whole articles published by the newspaper on the matter before court was defamatory.

Mkhatshwa argued that there was no consent by the complainants to have their photographs and their purported activity in the bedroom published.

The matter, which is before Principal Magistrate Dumsani Magagula, was then postponed to May 31, 2016.

ATUSWA FINALLY REGISTERED

THE Amalgamated Trade Unions of Swaziland (ATUSWA) is finally registered as a requirement of meeting the ILO benchmarks.

ILO stands for International Labour Organisations. It is a world organisation that is responsible for taking care of the welfare of workers in the countries that are members of the United Nations (UN).

The registration was done on Monday and they got their registration certificate at the ministry of labour and social security yesterday.

This was revealed by Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula. Magagula is currently in Botswana for a conference that is held in preparation for the ILO conference.

The minister will present a progress report on the issues that were raised by ILO and. She would also make a report on the benchmarks set by the US for the country to reclaim Africa Growth and Opportunities Act (AGOA) status. The ILO conference will be



held in Geneva in Switzerland next month. Magagula said the registration of ATUSWA was a step in the right direction as far as meeting the ILO benchmarks was concerned.

She said this gave hope that the country would be able to regain the status of being able to trade in the AGOA programme.

She said the ministry of labour and social security had done all it had to do and now the ball was in the court of Parliament to make sure that it enacts legislations that would place the country in the right position to participate in the programme.

The legislations that are supposed to be enacted include the Public Order Bill, Police Bill, Correctional Services Bill and the amendment of Suppression of Terrorism Act.

ORGANISATIONS FREE TO ASSEMBLY WITHOUT PRIOR PERMISSION

MINISTER of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Edgar Hillary has revealed that organisations are free to meet without obtaining permission for their gatherings.

The minister said this during his presentation on the Public Order Bill at the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) Info Pre-sessions held in Geneva yesterday.

Swaziland was making its second appearance at the UPR after it first did so in 2011.

Hillary told a gallery filled with representatives from 193 UN states that the Swaziland Government has done away with a clause requiring groups intending to meet to apply for permission seven days before they hold that particular gathering.

Hillary, however, revealed that the amended Bill was still in parliament and has been given a certificate of urgency.

However, it should be noted that the present Bill currently in parliament states "the convenor of a gathering shall as soon as possible but not later that seven days before the date of the intended gathering deliver by hand to the local authority written notice of the gathering, signed by the convenor, in accordance with the provi-

sions of this section and substantially in the form set out in Section 1".

This brought an uproar amongst the group of the civil society members who were watching the live streaming of the UPR Info Pre-sessions being screened at Mountain Inn Hotel courtesy of COSPE and LHRS. Many are of the notion that they are supposed to obtain permission before holding a gathering.

Delivering his presentation, the minister mentioned that the Suppression of Terrorism Act has been amended and the Bill seeks to redefine the definition of terrorism.

"The intention behind the amendment of the two pieces of legislations is to be in line with the Constitution

of Swaziland.

"The legislature has already invited the public to comment on the piece of legislation and a number of organisations have already registered their concerns," he said.

...Public Order Bill and Suppression of Terrorism Act unpopular

EVEN after a lengthy presentation on the Suppression of Terrorism Act and the Public Order Bill, a lot of countries recommended the repealing of the legislations.

It was said the legislations are an infringement to human rights and the freedom of expression. Countries like Algeria, Portugal and Latonia recommended that Swaziland upgrade on issues of freedom of expression and the right to assembly.

Angola recommended that the kingdom improves the prison establishment as well as over-crowding.

The minister responded by saying prisoners in Swaziland get three meals a day and in terms of overcrowding he said this was an international crisis. Countries like Argentina recommended the prohibition of traditional practices that put in jeopardy children with albinism.

Armenia recommended that the country have a transparent appointment of the judiciary system as well as of the armed forces.

Australia had concerns about issues of forced marriages which allow children less than 18 years

old to be forcefully wedded and issues of inheritance taken away from widows.

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Lorraine Hlophe, responded by saying the constitution does not compel women to forcefully marry.

She further said the constitution allowed a woman to inherit her deceased's spouse property.

Czech Republic recommended that the country revise its constitution since it has a lot of human rights infringement clauses.

Kenya recommended that the country refrain from torturing suspects, guarantee of peaceful assembly, while Norway recommended that activists facing charges should have these withdrawn and trade unions be formally registered.

Norway further showed concern on the judiciary being subject to undue interference.

While Slovenia was concerned that the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill has not yet been enacted into law.

It also showed concerns on the issues of stigma and discrimination especially concerning persons living with HIV.

SD commended for FPE at UPR

THE Kingdom of Swaziland was yesterday commended on the implementation of the free primary education at the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) Info Presessions held in Geneva.

This was revealed at the live streaming of the UPR pre-sessions where the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Edgar Hillary was making his presentation infront of the United Nations. The UPR Pre-sessions bring together Permanent Missions, National Human Rights Institutions (NHRIs) and Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) to discuss the human rights situation of states one month prior to their

review at the UPR Working
Group. The Pre-sessions offer permanent delegations the opportunity
to be informed on the status of
implementation of recommendations made during the previous
review, while providing space for
civil society to influence the
process by lobbying several delegations at once.

After the minister made his presentation, members from all the states made their commendation and recommendations to Swaziland and most of them commended the country for free primary school education and the banning of corporal punishment in schools.

... Recommends SD to consider FSE

THOUGH Swaziland was commended for the rolling out of free primary education, some countries went on to recommend that the kingdom also implements free secondary school education.

In its submissions to Swaziland, a representative from Armenia recommended that the free secondary education be implemented, since the enrolment at this level is low, with pupils dropping out due to various reasons.

Meanwhile Burkina Faso repre-

sentatives also recommended the removal of secondary education fees.

Making his replies, the minister highlighted to the members that the Swazi government pays for orphaned and vulnerable children (OVC) education in secondary school and also for tertiary education.

"The rolling out of the FPE has eradicated illiteracy, enrolment at primary school has increased from 59 to 74 percent, as more children stay at school," he said.

SWAZI TV TO OPEN GOSPEL CHANNEL

SWAZI TV will soon operate another channel as a result of the digital migration.

The digital migration comes with an opportunity whereby many television channels can be opened.

They are 20 in total. Swazi TV will be operating some of them and it will be known as Swazi TV 2. The channel was opened for a short time during a demonstration on how to connect a set top box.

The demonstration was done by ministry of ICT engineer Sakhile Dlamini.

TV2 station will be broadcasting gospel programmes.

This was all shown yesterday during the Local Content Development Strategy workshop, which is currently held until tomorrow at Royal Swazi Convention Centre in Ezulwini.

The digital migration is an initiative driven by the ministry of information, communications and technology (ICT).

Ministry of ICT's Sibusiso
Dube stated that digital migration had benefits like providing a

better picture quality and make dissemination of information effective. He said messages would also be directed to specific audiences.

Dube said the process of digital migration was being driven by the International

Telecommunications Unions (ITU). This is a world organisation that regulates the telecommunications sector in the world. The digital migration process was started in 2004, four years before the ministry of ICT was established in 2008.

He said the union had three regions, which included region one. This region includes Africa, Europe and the Middle East.

Deadline

This region, according to Dube, chose June 17, 2015 as a dead-line. However Dube said, the countries in the Southern African Development Community (SADC) chose December 2013 to migrate but could not because there were problems.

The deadline was then pushed to June 2015.

Again, the deadline was never met because there were no settop boxes. It had to be pushed to December 31.

When that deadline came, history had to repeat itself as the deadline was never met again because there not enough suppliers of the set-top boxes.

There was also a problem of other countries in SADC that had not migrated. The problem then was that the country could not migrate and leave its neighbours behind. That is how the December 2016 deadline was set, which is outside the ITU mandate.

There were only four SADC countries that had migrated at that time. They included Mauritius, Namibia, Malawi and Tanzania.

Dube said reasons to migrate included the fact that the world had to change and Swaziland could not be left behind.

He said another reason was that spectrums were saved by the migration. In terms of progress, the country had already installed 16 transmitters around the country. Set-top boxes, Dube said, were there but still not readily available.

He said they had expected the private sector to get set-top boxes, but to date, they had not supplied these essential gadgets.

May 17 D-day for suspended TSC boss

SUSPENDED Teaching Service Commission (TSC) Executive Secretary Mduduzi Nkambule will hear if he will escape scot free from the corruption charges he faces on May 17, 2016 (next Tuesday).

High Court Judge Titus Mlangeni will deliver a ruling on Nkambule's application to be discharged and acquitted of the charges of contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006 in that he failed to disclose

his interest, in a meeting, where a decision to promote his wife Jabulile Patience Nkambule to the position of head teacher of Manzini Central Primary School was taken.

At the close of the crown's case, Nkambule filed an application in terms of Section 174 (4) of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, which stipulates that if there is no evidence warranting conviction of the accused, the court may acquit and discharge the suspect.

Nkambule is represented by lawyer Ben J Simelane in the matter. It was argued that there was no evidence strong enough to convict Nkambule; therefore, he should be acquitted.

Yesterday, Judge Mlangeni was supposed to issue a ruling on the application, but he postponed it to next Tuesday, saying after he said he needed some papers to be filed by both attorneys.

The state is opposing the applica-

The judge said the lawyers should file authorities on which they base their arguments. Nkambule was told that his lawyer would be informed of what would happen on Tuesday because the High Court was currently on recess. The judge said should he not be available on the day to deliver judgment, he would request the judge who would be on duty to deal with

urgent matters to hand it down on his behalf.

Nkambule was arrested by officers from the Anti Corruption Commission (ACC) in October 2013 and he was admitted to E5 000 bail.

He was, on December 16, 2013, suspended from work, as a result of the charge of contravening Section 27 (1) read with Section 35 (1) of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

Section 27 (1) reads; "A member or employee of a public body commits an offence of corruption where that member or employee or an immediate member of the family of that member or employee has a direct or indirect interest in any company or undertaking with which that public body proposes to deal, or that member or employee has a personal interest, or votes or participates in the proceedings of that public body relating to that dealing or decision."

When he appeared before court yesterday, he was accompanied by family members. His bail was extended.

Land owner defrauded E280 000 by 'con' agent

A man posing as an estate agent allegedly defrauded an unsuspecting land owner over E280 000 in Manzini last month.

Sandile Ntando Dlamini of Sidwashini in Mbabane is said to have defrauded Sandile Eugene Dlamini of his E281 844.41, which was the money the latter was supposed to be paid after selling his land situated at Ngwane Park with the help of the former.

It is said, however, after Sandile Ntando Dlamini (who was dealing with everything pertaining the sale of the property as he claimed to be an agent), entered the wrong account number in the papers and the bank that was dealing with the cash transactions called to alert him of such.

Instead of giving them the account number of the owner (Sandile Eugene Dlamini), Ntando gave them his.

This was confirmed by Inspector Mpendulo Dlamini, who is investigating the matter. He stated that after the property owner started questioning the bank about his money, it was then that they discovered the fraud.

"The bank quickly froze his account, which was over E60 000 less as he had already spent part of the money and a case was opened against him," he explained.

However, when the suspect was contacted after the case was opened by the complainant against him, his mobile phone was not available on the Swazi MTN network.

"The suspect is said to have called the property owner and introduced himself as a property agent, before setting up a meeting at his office, where the former gave him the go ahead to sell his property," Dlamini added.

Chief Police Information Officer Khulani Mamba also confirmed the matter, stating that police were looking for this man. "We also urge the public to alert the police of the whereabouts of this suspect," Mamba accen-

The remainder of the money from the suspect's account is said to have been returned to the complainant.

with heavy hearts as their daughter has still not been found.

Nothando was reportedly last seen in the company of a dreadlocked man about 10 days ago in Big Bend whilst she was playing with her friends in her yard at Hlanze Village. The man was seen walking with her towards the Bend Inn.

Police responded to the missing child by putting up a cash reward of E20 000 for any leads to the recovery of Nothando, but nothing has come up.

The police also staged an extensive search to find the little girl, but so far their efforts have been in vain, hence they are requesting for public's assistance to the extent of offering cash reward.

The girl is said to be one metre tall, slim and has a round face. She is said to have protruding teeth, she stammers when she talks and has small ears.

She was last seen wearing a black pair of jeans, striped Tshirt with a cat emblem, green and white school jersey and sandals, commonly known as emab-

Confirming the matter, Chief Police Information Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba said police, especially in the Lubombo region, were investigating the matter.

"Lubombo police are working around the clock to find the girl and the long arm of the law is about to close in on the suspect," Mamba warned. He added that the cash reward of E20 000 still stands for any leads that would help in the recovery of the eightyear-old girl.

He indicated that the identity of the person with such information would be treated with utmost confidentiality.

SRA cited in non-payment of temporary teachers

THE issue of the non-pay of temporary teachers has taken another twist as the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) is now seemingly using the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) to stall payment of temporary teach-

The contract teachers have been made to work without pay for the past four months, causing several meetings to be held by the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) with the ministry of education in trying to find a solution to the already pressing

At some point in time, SNAT met

.

with Ministry of Education Principal Secretary Pat Muir to discuss the payment of the temporary teachers.

During the meeting, the temporary teachers were promised to be paid by the end of last month.

But that was not to be as the teachers remained unpaid.

This prompted SNAT to march to the ministry of education to deliver a petition last Tuesday. They gave the ministry until last Friday to sort out the issue.

However, the teachers have still not been paid up to now. Another meeting between SNAT, the ministry of education and the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) was convened on Monday.

It transpired in that meeting that

SRA was demanding that taxes should first be paid before the money could be paid to the temporary teachers.

SNAT Secretary General Muzi Mhlanga highlighted that the ministry had not started rolling out the payment to the teachers because SRA was demanding a payment of 33 percent of the money as tax.

"The ministry said they wanted the members (temporary teachers) to agree on the tax issue through a letter. They also raised the fact that running of salaries for permanent teachers begin tomorrow (Tuesday)," Mhlanga said.

He said SNAT could not agree on the proposal to tax their members to the bone. It was agreed that all teachers would be paid at the end of the month and charged normal tax.

King to open UNISWA's Crop Production Centre at Luyengo

HIS Majesty King Mswati III will on Friday open a state of the art National Crop Production Centre at Luyengo campus.

In a press conference yesterday, at UNISWA Kwaluseni campus, University Registrar Dr Salebona Simelane stated that the state of the art structure features nine teaching labs, eight research labs,

eight technician offices, 27 staff offices and a library, among other

This is not the only building that will be opened by His Majesty on this special day.

Launched

The Department of Consumer Sciences will be launched as a new Faculty of Consumer Sciences, resulting in two faculties in Luyengo Campus.

Simelane stated that the faculty would start operating as an independent faculty on July 1, 2016

but its launch would be on Friday.

He said the Department of Consumer Sciences had grown by its own rights in terms of student intake, the number of degree programmes on offer, staff numbers and structures.

Enrolment

"The department offers four undergraduate degree programmes and a masters degree and its enrolment stands at 351 students hence the need for the faculty to start operating as an

independent faculty."

Other government funded buildings that will be officially opened by the King include a multi purpose hall which has a sitting capacity of 500 people.

Women who attend short training courses at Luyengo will now be able to be accommodated at a women's hostel that was built through funds from the government of Japan. This hostel is meant to empower communities in the much needed agricultural skills.

Luyengo to produce safer, efficient seeds

WITH the country suffering from a severe drought due to a change in weather patterns, Luyengo Campus through its National Crop Production Centre, has come up with a solution of producing more safer and efficient seeds.

This was revealed by the University Registrar Dr Salebona Simelane, who stated that the NCPC would go a long way in assisting the agricultural sector by providing the right seeds for the nation according to the regions of the country. Simelane pointed out that what trouble the nation the most was that people were using genetically modified seeds (bomasheshisa) that were not right for the Swazi soil.


Dr Simelane stated that these seeds come with a disease, saying that was why there was now a regulation preventing such seeds from getting into the country. Dr Simelane stated that this facility would go a long way in helping scan any seeds which have problems. He added that this would not only be on seeds but on livestock. Simelane stated that the Swaziland Environment Authority helped the institution with the equipment. He stated that the country would now have safer and reliable seeds that would suit the different regions of the country as students and other experts were already working on producing such seeds.

SOLAR-POWERED LIGHTS FOR LIBRARY

POWER outages will be a thing of the past for Luyengo Library as the institution has installed a solar-powered lighting system. With help from the government of the Republic of China on Taiwan, a main car park was constructed at Luyengo to increase car parking space for staff and visitors of the campus. The Taiwanese government also forked out money to install the lighting system of the library. Not only will the lighting system help in power outages but also in saving energy costs. These facilities are also among the structures that will be officially opened by His Majesty during his visit to the campus on Friday.

CAMPUS ATTACK: -

UNISWA STUDENTS NO LONGER FEEL SAFE

IN the wake of the brutal attack of a University student by her boyfriend at the University of Swaziland, Kwaluseni campus, students no longer feel safe.

The students want the institution to change its policies when it comes to providing security for them. Some of those interviewed said they were of the view it was not the security company that is to blame but the UNISWA administration.

They said the administration was the one that gave the security company the terms of engagement thus they were to blame.

They stated that the security guards were so vigilant when it comes to watching out for people who committed petty offences such as hanging their laundry by the windows, sneaking alcohol into dormitories, cooking inside campus and a lot of other offences.

Criminals

They said so focused were these security guards on petty offences such that they even forgot the important service they must provide to the students, which is to keep them safe from criminals who came into the campus to steal from them

or worse to hurt them.

"No matter how we may fire and rehire different security companies as long as they are sent to guard against sex, cooking, squatting and alcohol more than the lives of students, there would always be theft incidents and domestic violence oncamp. Let the transformation start from the administration, proper realisation of the challenges faced and aligning the policies to ensure fulfilment of such."

THE Student Representative Council was expected to meet with the Dean of Student Affairs yesterday where they were to discuss matters affecting students, including the shocking incident which saw one student Nothando Mnisi hacked by her boyfriend inside campus.

UNISWA SRC President Brian Sangweni confirmed the meeting, saying they would discuss the issue of security with the Dean of Student Affairs first before a meeting with the students called to inform them about a way for-

Sangweni blamed the security company for the tragedy that befell the institution. He said there were particular provisions that the

salaries.

They said no matter how many times security companies were changed in the institution, they would always stick to what the warden tells them to focus on.

This, according to the students, is

security company does not follow. He said, for example, if someone enters the institution they are supposed to provide their student card at the gate to show that they were students of the institution. He said under normal circumstances if they had a competent security company everyone entering the gate would be searched for any weapons as they are not allowed in the school premises.

"In some universities they have advanced safety devices that detect for any weapons carried by people entering the institutions," Sangweni said.

He added that it was time UNISWA did the same in terms of upgrading the security at the institution.



SUPREME Court Judge Prince Senzangakhona took on the **Attorney General** Majahenkhaba Dlamini during the case of the Estate Policy.

The case was filed as a review application by the attorney general and it was heard by a full bench comprising the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala, who was sitting with Judges Prince Senzangakhona, Benjamin Odoki, Zonke Magagula and Maxine Langwenya.

The review application was against a case of the Supreme Court, which ruled in favour of the Master of the High Court and beneficiaries of the estate of the late Chief Sibengwane Ndzimandze.

The case became known as the estate policy after the then minister of justice and constitutional affairs Sibusiso Shongwe issued a directive that all widows from estates of Swazi customary marriages will benefit just like those married in civil rites and community of property.

The AG stated that he was appealing against the Master of the High Court who was not present in court.

Appeal

He said he could not represent the Master of the High Court at the same time. He had filed the appeal because the Supreme Court misdirected itself in ruling that the Estate Policy was a good one.

He said the late Chief Sibengwane had married his wives in Swazi law and custom and never left a Will at his death.

Therefore, he said, the estate could not be distributed in terms of the Interstates Succession Act and not subject to Swazi customary law.

"The Interstate Act does not apply to customary marriages. This was an unfortunate decision by the Supreme Court. When you marry,

you choose the legal system," he said.

However, Judge Prince Senzangakhona questioned the AG's approach to the Supreme

He asked why the attorney general had approached the Supreme Court when he was at the same time questioning its review pow-

He directed that the attorney general should be clear he had accepted that the Supreme Court had in the past reviewed its own decisions, by bringing his review application.

Ouestion

"You cannot bring this matter here and at the same time question the review powers of this court. You are the number one lawyer of the state. That is where I have a problem here," the judge said.

The AG said Section 148 of the country's constitution did not state that res judicata has been done away with.

He said the court had dealt with the case to finality. However, he did not deny that the Supreme Court could have such powers on exceptional circumstances.

Judge Prince Senzangakhona is the former attorney general, a position he occupied before he was appointed a High Commissioner in many countries.

"The AG has brought this application in terms of Section 148 of the constitution, meaning you understand that the Supreme Court has review powers," the judge said.

Master has no jurisdiction over Swazi law and custom issues - AG

ATTORNEY General Majahenkhaba Dlamini has said the Master of the High Court does not know issues pertaining to the institutions governed by Swazi Law and Custom marriages.

He said the institutions such as Inkhosana and Indlunkhulu were beyond the scope of the Master of the High Court and to deal with the estate in terms of the latter, she (Master) would have to be re-educated first.

The AG said marriages in Swazi

law and custom should not be administered by the Master of the High Court in terms of the Interstate Succession Act. "If there is a dispute on the discourts. If the case is not resolved then it can come to this court after all the stakeholders have been heard and considered," Dlamini said.



TEACHERS CALL FOR 50/50 GENDER

THE Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Hhohho branch wants the issue of lack of female leaders within the organisation addressed as a matter of urgency.

This emanated from their gender caucus, which was held at Bulembu Country Lodge on Saturday b

FORMER Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) president Sibongile Mazibuko said the gender imbalance in the organisation's leadership was caused by deeply rooted social structures that ultimately programmed people to believe male leaders were better than females.

Mazibuko said society has programmed most from a very young age to believe that males were naturally better leaders than females.

She said this was a wrong perception and needed to be changed.

"It needs to become a policy that SNAT should have an equal number of male leaders as females if the organisation is to reach the 2030 Sustainable Development goals," she said.

Celucolo Mndzebele, however, warned the organisation against adopting such a harsh feminist mindset and wondered if they were not over-stretching things by adopting it as a policy.

He wondered if the new way of thinking where men are equal to women would change as even the Lord's prayer was from 'Our Father to Our Mother' and wondered if children would assume their mother's surname.


Mndzebele also mentioned that women were the ones not voting for their female counterparts because if they did then the organisation would have more female leaders since the organisation had more females voting.

Bongiwe Khumalo, NEC Gender Officer, said the notion that women leaders were more empathetic and quick to show emotion than males had to stop.

She said the only way this could be done was if males showed more support to their female counterparts.

PARLIAMENT STAFF LEFT WITH 13 DAYS

THE staff in Parliament is left with only 13 working days to indicate if they want to remain under the employ of the institution.

Those still interested in being members of the Parliamentary Service staff would have to submit their application letters for the positions they are currently occupying on or before May 31.

A minute written by the Clerk to Parliament Ndvuna Dlamini to the Parliamentary Service staff, states; 'every officer employed in Parliament should apply or indicate in writing, whether he or she chooses to continue with his or her employment with the Parliamentary Service or whether he/she shall opt to be re-deployed elsewhere in the public service.

Transition

Dlamini said this transition was pursuant to Section 29 (1) of the Parliamentary Service Act, 2015.

Dlamini issued the minute on April 28, 2016 and copied it to the Chairperson of the Parliamentary



Service Board Senate President Gelane Zwane and the Speaker of the House of Assembly Themba Msibi.

The Parliamentary Service Act, 2015 sought to operationalise Section 131 (1) of the constitution which states that: "There shall be a parliamentary service which shall form part of the public service of Swaziland.'

Constitution

The section of the constitution also states that the parliamentary service shall be administered by a Parliamentary Service Board consisting of the president and speaker who shall be chairperson on a rotational

Currently, the PSB members are MP Mjuluko Dlamini, Senator Prince Kusa Dlamini, Deputy Senate nedsom T President Ngom'yayona Gamedze. Deputy Speaker Esther Dlamini and Trusty Gina. Section 132 (1) of the constitution states that: 'There shall be a clerk to parliament and such other staff of the parliamentary service as the Parliamentary Service Board may

The constitution provides that the clerk to parliament shall be the controlling officer of the parliamentary

...NDVUNA DEMANDS APPRAISAL REPORTS

FOLLOWING the transition taking place in parliament, heads of departments have been asked to compile and submit performance targets and Appraisal Reports of officers under their supervision.

Clerk to Parliament Ndvuna Dlamini has set the deadline for submitting both targets and appraisal reports as Friday May 27, 2016. "The Performance Appraisal Reports will be submitted to the board for evaluation when requests for re-employment and promotions are being considered," Dlamini informed the staff through a minute he sent to them on May 4. Following concerns that the staff members were not directly engaged on the process, Dlamini said a workshop on the parliamentary service transition would be conducted before May 31, on the new terms and conditions of service.

"We hope to have an open and healthy discussion. Moreover, a comparative analysis of conditions and benefits offered in the public service vis-a-vis the new Parliamentary Service," Dlamini said. He said the discussion and policy decisions to be taken will be informed by the provisions of Section 29 (2) which states that the transition shall not in any way disadvantage any employee.

Dlamini said by pushing the deadline for indicating intention or re-employment to month end was because they were cognisant of the fact that the transition process has to be properly managed.

Spirit

"Pursuant to the minute dated 28 April, 2016, the office of the clerk to parliament would like to clarify that the Notice is in line with the spirit and dictates of Section 29 of the Parliamentary Service Act, No. 6 of 2015," said Dlamini. He further explained: "what is worthy of note is that the Act was passed on 12 November 2015. Section 29 (1) categorically states that all members of staff should indicate within the six months of the coming into force of the Aerolniv si

He said the partitimentary administration was obliged to issue such a Notice before the expiry of the six months.

"Bearing in mind that the law was passed in November last year, the six months expired on 30 April, 2016," Dlamini explained.

Pistol belongs to my late father, accused tells court





Rising awareness for health benefits of male circumcision



ONE out of every three males in the world are circumcised.

However, that figure rises to almost 100 percent in Muslim and Jewish countries where male circumcision is a cultural imperative. These are some of new statistics published in Population Health Metrics that will guide policymakers to come up with new initiatives and reassess existing programmes dealing with male circumcision as a means to lower HIV infections.

Religious

Population data for 237 countries and United Nations figures for males aged 15-64 were used for the study. The report includes reasons why men underwent the circumcision procedure. About half of all circumcisions were done for religious and cultural reasons.

"The prevalence of circumcision varies widely in western countries led by the USA (71 per cent), New Zealand (33 percent), Australia (27per cent), the UK (21 per cent), France (14 percent), Germany (11. percent), Sweden (five percent), Italy (three percent) and Ireland



(one percent)," the study reported. Male circumcision was almost

universal in countries where the Muslim or Jewish faith are predominant, including Iran (where male circumcision stands at 100 per cent), Iraq (99 per cent), West Bank (99 per cent), Yemen (99 per cent), Indonesia (93 per cent), Syria (93 per cent), and Israel (92 per cent). The study was headed by Dr.

Brian Morris, Professor Emeritus at the University of Sydney, who found that male circumcision prevalence worldwide stands at 38%

Affirmative

"Given the known benefits and low risks of male circumcision and recent affirmative recommendations in the interests of public health and disease prevention by the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, the WHO and UNAIDS, these findings on male circumcision across

geographies and cultures may help to guide policy development and resource allocation in all countries," Dr. Morris said of his work.

Male circumcision has been promoted in Swaziland as a means to lessen the risk of contracting HIV, though not eliminate the risk entire-

Two years ago, in 2014, this column reported that more evidence emerged in favour of the procedure when data was published showing the ratio between the benefits of circumcision and its risks is an overwhelming 100 to one.

Normal

Dr. Morris also headed that study. He expressed belief that circumcision is so beneficial that all babies should be circumcised at birth as normal public health procedure, the way all babies are given vaccinations here in Swaziland. To Morris and other circumcision advocates,

this is just common sense.

"Both vaccines and circumcision have a benefit for the entire population, but they also carry a risk that affects only a very small proportion of individuals.

There are also extremely rarely deaths from each. A vaccines is highly specific (dealing with one particular disease) whereas the protective effects of circumcision cover a wide array of medical conditions," Morris said in an interview with an American publication.

Lessening

In addition to help lessening the risk of a man acquiring HIV, circumcision also assists with the prevention of urinary tract infections, penile cancer and the transmission of sexually transmitted diseases other than HIV.

For years one of the world's largest medical bodies devoted to child health care, the American

Academy of Pediatrics (pediatrics is the medical science dealing with health care from a person's birth through infancy and childhood up to age 18), has confirmed the health benefits of circumcision. However, for years the group felt it was up to parents to decide whether their male babies should have this procedure. No more. Two years ago, the group moved toward advocacy of circumcision as a mandatory procedure required for all male babies.

However, the recommendation has proved controversial. According to opponents of circumcision, who call themselves the "intactivists," circumcision is little more than "genital mutilation." These critics have a point when they argue that in the developing world's clinics and hospitals haven't the resources or standards of state-of-the-art US facilities.

Infection

At such places, babies undergoing circumcision operations face "serious health risks, including infection, hemorrhage, surgical mishaps and

Arguing the other side of the coin, advocates of circumcision note that globally these problems are very rare. Only 0.2 percent (or two-tenths of one percent) of babies undergoing circumcision experience any negative complications.

"Just like failure to vaccinate, failure to circumcise will put your son at serious risk of adverse medical conditions and he could indeed die from some of them.

What's more he will harm others from sexually transmitted infections. Denial of infant male circumcision is denial of his rights to good health, something that all responsible parents should consider carefully," Dr. Morris said. In Swaziland, male circumcision has been introduced as a procedure done in adult-

Swazi men choose to voluntarily undergo this procedure on their own as a means to safeguard themselves against a sexually-transmitted infec-

The time has come to promote the procedure in infants as well.




But now, to business.

Condemn this passing fad of - oh, dear, Field Marshall? Excuse me, Field Marshall? While we applaud your loathing of democracy, we do ask that you not fire your golden ceremonial pistol into the ceiling as they've just finished the fresco. Thank you.

As I was saying: everywhere we look, the rabble want to be the masters of their own fate. Is this what our ancestors fought for? Did our noble forebears shed the blood, sweat and tears of peasants to build all this just so some Kardashianworshipping rube with a ballot paper can take it all away? Of course not.

To these heroes, with their giant headlines about lottery winners and suburban sex scandals and endless, endless murders, we say thank you. Your cheque is in the mail. 2 2018

I would also like to applaud some of our friends here tonight who To take a more robust approach ab may against the free press. Vladimir, we're all in awe of the work you do to keep your country safe from journalism. To the Chinese delegation, well, wow. Over 40 journalists in prison in China, ladies and gentlemen! Yes, let's give them a big hand! What's that, premier? They're not in prison? Oh, I see, they're in prison but not imprisoned? They're all researching stories about the humane conditions inside Chinese prisons, and they just want to be thorough so they're spending between five and 25

years inside so they get the story right? Wonderful.

To our friends in Washington, guys, it's been a tough few years but don't lose hope: one of these days that weasel, Edward Snowden, is going to make a mistake and you're going to slip a black bag over his head faster than you can say "Next stop Guantánamo, sucker!'

And speaking of which: Denmark? Did I hear right that you gave Washington permission to keep a military jet in your country on standby, in case Snowden ever showed his treacherous little face in Scandinavia? Your part of the world is known as a bastion of freedom and democracy, but how wonderful to see you shaking off that awful reputation! Inspiring!

YATSI GURRE PROJECTS WORTH OVER EIBN

has grew from about 350 employees in 2004 to 3 000 in 2015

INYATSI Construction is currently involved in projects worth over E1billion in Swaziland only.

The company, headquartered in Swaziland, also has operations in South Africa, Zambia and Mozambique, and has registered companies in Botswana and Namibia.

In Swaziland, the company is also part of the Kiss Joint Venture, which comprises of Kukhanya and Stefanutti Stocks responsible for the construction of the International Convention Centre and Five Star Hotel (ICCFSH). Except for the ICC and FSH, the company's current projects include upgrading of portable water supply in Siphofaneni, King Mswati III International Airport staff housing, Ezulwini sewerage system and Hlane road extension.

Asked about the company's growth prospects for the ongoing year, Inyatsi Construction Swaziland Chairman Frans Pienaar said the group was currently exploring all options to ensure that they sustained their growth throughout their markets across Sub-Saharan Africa.

In Swaziland, Pienaar said the company has grown from around

350 employees in 2004 to more than 3 000 in 2015.

Registered

Inyatsi Construction was first registered in Swaziland in 1982. Due to a number of factors, including changes in shareholding, expansion into new markets, growth and diversification, Inyatsi Construction Group Holdings (Pty) Ltd (ICGH) was formed in 2007 as the holding company of Inyatsi and its regional subsidiaries in Southern Africa.

"We are consciously limiting our growth to less than 15 per-

cent per year in real terms to ensure we can fund the cash flow of the growth," said Pienaar.

However, he said the market in Swaziland remained under pressure and as a result their growth would be limited.

Pienaar said the construction market was increasingly getting more competitive while work was coming to the market slower than the industry requirements, adding it was not likely that the market would ease up anytime soon.

"The financial slowdown in the region has a significant impact on the local industry. With the region slowing down we have had to move some resources back to Swaziland and this places more pressure on local operations," he said.

Meanwhile, Pienaar applauded government for dedicating a lot of effort in infrastructure development saying this was the engine room for stimulating growth.

However, a lot was needed as slow growth historically has resulted in a shortfall.

"There are more and more pressures from foreign entities playing in our markets and we will have to up our game to remain competitive," Pienaar said.

He said the standards achieved in the local industry was world class and would stand the country in good stead in decades to come.

The company's export services in the Sub-Saharan Africa included the Beira port access road, Mohamba flood repairs in Mozambique.

Chikankata and Solwezi roads and Kabita Raft Foundations in Zambia.

In a book entitled 'The Civil Engineering Contractor,' Inyatsi said contracts should not be so rigidly applied in Africa, as they were designed to suit first world conditions.

Banking industry time deposits up 34.6 percent

TIME deposits held within the banking sector has increased by 34.6 percent.

According to the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) recent economic report March/April, 2016, time deposits in the economy stood around E7 billion compared to the same period three years ago when it stood at 5.2 billion.

Time deposits is cash deposited at banks for a fixed period, they are commonly referred to as fixed deposits.

An economist, who spoke on a condition of anonymity from one of the banks, said this notable increase in time deposits could largely be attributed to corporate who were allegedly motivated by the higher interest rate environment. "Time deposits by their nature yield higher returns than savings deposits because banks keep time deposits for longer periods than savings deposits," she said.

The financial economist said interestingly there has been little significant increase in deposits by individuals, which could be a sign

that individuals were not taking advantage of the high interest rate environment to maximise their returns they could get from depositing money at banks.

Savings deposits over the same period experienced relatively flat growth.

Meanwhile, the report said savings deposits have increased by 23 percent, which was an increase from a low base of about E 1.3 billion to E1.5 billion over the period under review.

Deposits

Savings deposits are those accounts held for transaction purposes like the ones tied to an ATM card account.

"Savings deposits are not exactly stagnant; they are just growing at a slower pace than time deposits," the economist said.

The economist said the preference of the type of deposit chosen was largely tied to the purpose for which an individual was using those deposits. "An individual could have both a savings and time deposits with a bank and keep them both for different reasons," she

"They could keep the savings deposit account because he can withdraw it anytime unlike time deposits in which the deposit is fixed for a certain period," she added.

She said depending on their preference; she could not tell whether Swazis have grown to prefer time deposits over savings deposits.

"From the data I have observed, as I have mentioned, it is mainly the corporates that are driving the growth rates of time deposits and therefore driving up the money supply in the economy," she stressed.

Currently broad money in the Swaziland economy stood at E13 billion and was up 29 percent from E10.1 billion.

Broad money refers to the total money that was floating within the economy, which when broken down is referred to as quasi money and narrow money.

Quasi money referred to time deposits and savings deposits that were in banks in conjunction with the total money in coins and notes that were floating in the economy, it currently stood at E8.6 billion as opposed to E6.5 billion in 2013.

STA SCOOPS SILVER AWARD AT TOURISM INDABA

THE Swaziland Tourism Authority (STA) made the country proud when their stand came third and scooped a silver award at the Tourism Indaba held at ICC Durban over the past weekend.

Meanwhile the Tourism Indaba ended on a high note with the local exhibitors sharing different sentiments and experiences on the success of the annual travel trade show hosted by the city of Durban in KwaZulu Natal Province.

A majority of the local tourism industry players gathered at the ICC in Durban were excited about the trade show and success of the meetings they had arranged prior to going to the Indaba.

While they were elated about the success of the show, the decline in the number of buyers attending this year's instalment of the trade show kept on surfacing with some noting that every year the numbers keep on declining. Some of those interviewed on the last day of the show raised the issue of the decline in numbers.

One being the Marketing Manager Bongani Dlamini who said the statistics were declining, especially on the buyers side.

"But that does not make this trade show of less value because it still remains one of the important places where the industry meet. One cannot ignore it because tourism is all about being visible at all times owing to a lot of competition for destinations so you cannot allow for vacuum," he said.

Applauded

He also applauded the locals for coming out of the comfort zone and actually participating in such important meetings noting that the tourism players have realised the importance of going out and scout for business in such forums.

Chairman of the Hospitality and Tourism Association of Swaziland (HOTAS) Darron Raw, said Swazi exhibitors registered significant number of meetings, and said prospects for the industry's growth were high.

He was at the show in his capacity as chairman and also as an exhibitor him-

self since he is the Director of Swazi Trails, which is one of the adventure tour operators that attract scores of international visitors.

"This has been a successful business outing and indications are pointing at an increase in interest on Swaziland's tourism products. Industry players who attended the show largely agreed that the Indaba is always beneficial to them.

The interest in attending such important meetings is growing within the industry which shows they have realised the importance attached to such show," said Raw. The show, which opened last Saturday, attracted over 13 000 scheduled meetings between international tourism buyers and African establishments.

About 23 local establishments



attended this year's Indaba, and were housed at the Swaziland stand, 17 of whom were able to be allocated space at the stand while the rest were 'walk abouts'. The delegation was led by the Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Jabulani Mabuza and the Swaziland Tourism Authority management led by CEO Eric Maseko and Marketing Manager Bongani Dlamini.

South Africa's downgrade duck good news for Swaziland

SWAZILAND can breathe a sigh of relief at least for now as the international rating agency, Moody's decided to not downgrade South Africa's sovereign rating.

According to reports from South African media, Moody's rating agency left its rating of South Africa's debt at Baa2, two levels above sub-investment grade, but assigned a negative outlook, citing risks to implementation of structural and fiscal reforms.

University of Swaziland (UNISWA) economist and lecturer Sibusiso Khumalo said due to the interconnection of the Swazi and South African economies, the downgrade would have been catastrophic results for the local economy.

"Given the number of South African subsidiaries in the country coupled with trade volumes between the two states, any serious economic issues that arise from our neighbouring state would have consequences within our economy," he said.

However, he said the risk was not gone yet.

"Moody's is not the only international rating agency, so South Africa, and by extension Swaziland, is not out of the woods yet. Fitch and Standards & Poor's (S&P), which are international rating agencies, are also due to rate South Africa," he said.

S&P is due to rate South Africa in June and December.

The economist said if any of these rating agencies would downgrade South Africa's debt to junk status, investor confidence in that country would fall leading to capital flight from international investors.

"This would likely cause the lilangeni against the dollar to rapidly depreciate and consequently lead to an increase in inflation as imports would be more expensive pushing up the general price level," he said.

He said unemployment rates of the country would likely experience an uptick as firms' production inputs would increase resulting in firms shedding jobs to maintain their profit margins.

As is the norm with an increase in inflation there would more than likely be an accompa ging interest rate hike to deal with the inflation.

Khumalo added that the country would then experience an increase in borrowing costs.

"This would be especially felt by the government which has to finance its deficit both in terms of its domestic and external debt," he said.

"We can only hope that South Africa is not downgraded as this would be very bad news for our local economy," he concluded.

We're not revising our outlook yet - Std Bank global markets

Mkhwanazi was responding to a question on the recent developments of South Africa's credit rating status following his outlook presentation in Swaziland during Standard Bank Global Markets breakfast held at Royal Villas, Ezulwini held last month.

In his presentation,

should the republic sovereign credit rating gets downgraded, both South Africa
and Swaziland would lose
investors, prices of assets
would drop due to lack of
demand, the rand/lilangeni
will weaken further, inflation will shoot up and the
average citizen will have to
endure higher costs for
goods and higher interest
rates.

However, Moody's left South Africa's credit rating unchanged over the weekend.

Asked if they would revise their outlook for both

Swaziland and South Africa, Mkhwanazi said not yet.

"We are not expecting major changes to our outlook; the risk lies with Standard and Poor's and Fitch (S&P) that rates SA just one notch above subinvestment grade, with a negative outlook. Moody's affirmed SA status two notches above sub investment, albeit with a negative outlook," he said in a responding email yesterday.

He said they read Moody's action as marginally positive and believed that growth would pick up next year, which was in line with their expectations.

"At least it buys South Africa more time to come up with growth enhancing reforms and policies. But market may wait for S&P on June 3, 2016, when S&P review is due," he said.

Mkhwanazi said that was why Moody's indicated that failure to push through growth policies or clarify policies might still lead to downgrade.

The next big hurdle to overcome would be due in June when both Standard and Poor's and Fitch issue their updated credit scores. S&P has the country one notch above junk, while Fitch sits two.

Farmers, maize retailers stand by NAMBoard

WHILE Members of Parliament have cried foul over the ban to purchase mealie-meal from South Africa by the National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBoard), farmers gave the parastal a thumbs up.

A farmer and maize retailer Paulina Shabangu said NAMBoard made a perfect decision as buying from SA not only affect farmers, but crippled the economy as well.

"What happened to buying locally and supporting each other? You find someone saying products from Swaziland are of poor quality, yet they do not give suggestions on how we can enhance our productivity," she said. Shabangu said the ban would be of great benefit to farmers as this would see the nation purchasing from the National Maize Corporation (MNC), thus allowing farmers to sell to NAMBoard too while boosting local revenues.

However, she was quick to mention that they were still not happy with the price NMC offered currently to maize farmers.

"But that does not give us an excuse to run and buy mealie-meal from South Africa and further drain the economy," she said. She said it was high time Swazis supported one another and consider what could happen if consumers rejected local products.

"Yes we cannot argue that buying mealile-meal from South Africa was good for those who were most affected by the current drought in different constituencies as most do not have enough food to sustain them. However, it was wrong for others to see such as a business opportunity thus were selling back to the Swazis. We should be supporting each other," she

Another maize retailer, Nombuso Dlamini said those who purchased meali-meal from South Africa and sold it back to Swazis were not doing any justice to the economy as all.

AFRICA NEEDS TO DEVELOP NEW WAYS OF STEMMING ILLICIT FINANCIAL FLOWS


CAPE TOWN - Over the last 50 years, African countries have lost about \$1 trillion to illicit financial flows.

This equates to around \$50 billion a year and is equivalent to all the official development assistance received by the continent over the same period. It is enough to wipe out Africa's total external debt of around \$250 billion and still leave \$600 billion for poverty alleviation and economic growth.

Illicit financial flows involve money that is illegally earned, transferred, or utilised. The direct effects of illicit financial flows include lost investment in poverty reducing programmes such as health, education and job creation. The indirect effects include lower per capita investment and income. These effects are so detrimental that in July 2015 African nations offered to forego international aid in exchange for western countries agreeing to close tax loopholes and shut down tax havens.

But as significant as these statistics are, they do not capture the changing nature of Africa's illicit flows. Over the course of the last 50 years these have gradually evolved. They have become more complex.

Centralised public sector corruption has transformed into decentralised private sector corruption. This change reflects Africa's developmental progress away from donor reliance to trade-led economic growth. African officials no longer primarily siphon off aid into foreign accounts. Instead they act as intermediaries and gatekeepers between access to resources and

markets on the one side, and mostly private sector companies on the other.

The changing nature of illicit flows was well illustrated in the leaked Panama Papers. The documents offer a window into the activities of 128 current and former political leaders and officials, as well as criminals, terrorist organisations, corporations, billionaires and celebrities. The papers show that Mossack Fonseca, the law firm from which the 11 million documents were leaked, helped clients launder money, dodge sanctions and evade tax using an array of mechanisms.

The main sources

Illicit financial flows typically arise from corruption, illegal exploitation, and tax evasion. Thus they are primarily a governance

problem arising from weak institutions and inadequate regulatory infrastructure. These include limited access to legal and financial expertise and misaligned domestic tax and trade reporting policies with global requirements. They also include outdated information gathering and sharing mechanisms, and a lack of political will.

Calculating the proportion of illicit financial flows that comprise corruption is difficult. But they have been estimated at around five percent of such global illicit flows. Some believe the figure for Africa may be much higher as the five percent does not include the role of corrupt practises in facilitating the trade and tax-related forms of illicit flows.

The Panama Papers also show that Mossack Fonseca facilitated the abusive system of transfer pricing. This entails the use of shell companies to move profits to low-tax or no-tax countries without leaving a paper trail. It also enabled trade misinvoicing. This involves under or overstating the price, quality or quantity of traded goods and services. Over the last 10 years, African countries have lost between \$242 billion and \$407 billion from trade misinvoicing alone. This practice accounts for around 60% of illicit financial flows. About 35% arises from criminal activity.

This shows that commercial activities are the largest component of illicit flows from the continent. It is followed by organised crime and then public sector corruption.

Efforts to stop flows

The regulatory implications of the Panama Papers are still gaining

traction.

But Oxfam's Tatu Ilunga and Transparency International's Craig Fagan argue that the leaked documents highlight the need for an overhaul of the global tax system. Africa has two significant endeavours aimed at curbing illicit flows and recovering the money stolen from the continent;

The United Nations Economic Commission for Africa's High Level Panel on Illicit Financial Flows, led by Thabo Mbeki, and

 The Africa Progress Panel, chaired by former UN general secretary Kofi Annan.

Both initiatives are still at the policy formulation phase.

But much more needs to be done. Closing tax havens and loopholes will significantly benefit Africa's economies. For example, South Africa was able to recover \$2 billion in taxes after tax authorities uncovered a multinational company engaged in abusive transfer pricing. But there is also a need to deepen the anti-corruption and regulatory institutions. This will limit the capability of corrupt leaders and officials. Examples include the US Kleptocracy Asset Recovery Initiative and the World Bank's Stolen Assets Recovery Initiative and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime.

Africa's democracies can be strengthened by entrenching transparency and accountability. As noted by the United Nations Economic Commission for Africa, measures could include strengthening Article 22 of the African Union Convention on Preventing and Combating Corruption. It could also include a governance mechanism in the African Peer Review Mechanism. Combating Africa's illicit financial flows will require a much closer and more active continental and global partnership than has historically been the case.

Unemployment hit its highest on record

JOHANNESBURG - STATS SA reported that unemployment had risen to 26.7% of the labour force in the first quarter of this year — the highest since the current method of collating the figures was introduced in 2008.

This was up from 24.5% in the previous three months and well above the 25.7% that had been predicted by economists. The number of people without a job rose by 521 000 to 5.71 million.

Manufacturing shed 100 000 jobs,

trade 119 000 and construction 77 000. Agriculture and government service were the only sectors in which employment grew.

The rand retreated more than two percent in the first quarter, partly because of the jobless rate but also because of a global commodity sell-off and a firmer dollar. The currency later recovered to trade 1.9% weaker at R15.15 to the dollar, near its worst level in a month.

Gauteng municipalities had the biggest fall in employment with

195 000 jobs lost. Six of the country's eight metros recorded job losses, with eThekwini, in KwaZulu-Natal, shedding 144 000 and Ekurhuleni, in Gauteng, 111 000. The Cape Town and Nelson Mandela Bay municipalities increased their payrolls by 4 000 and 3 000 jobs respectively.

After the decision by Moody's on Friday to keep its rating steady, Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan said he intended to show other agencies that this country was on the right economic track.

Gordhan said yesterday: "We developed a common intent among labour, business and government that we don't want to be downgraded and we have many positives to say about ourselves."

"All we can do is work as hard as we can to convince people out there that we are a country capable of solving its problems." President Jacob Zuma was scheduled to meet business and labour leaders yesterday.

Vodacom to shut down M-Pesa business (Mobile Money)

JOHANNESBURG - Mobile network Vodacom South Africa has moved to shut down its sluggish mobile money transfer service M-Pesa.

M-Pesa enables customers - particularly unbanked users - to transfer money from person-

to-person using mobile phone and text-messaging technology.

In 2010, Vodacom launched M-Pesa in South Africa and the company set a target of reaching 10 million local users.

But only 76 000 people were actively using the service last year, according to Vodacom's 2015 integrated report. Subsequently, reports state that Vodacom was reviewing the service and the company has confirmed that it will discontinue the product from June 30, 2016.


"Vodacom's decision is based

on the fact that the business sustainability of M-Pesa is predicated on achieving a critical mass of users," said Shameel Joosub, Vodacom's Chief Executive Officer. "Based on our revised projections and high levels of financial

Africa, there is little prospect of the M-Pesa product achieving this in its current format in the mid-term," said Joosub in a

statement. Joosub further said "Vodacom is fully committed to mitigating any inconvenience to customers" and that "their funds remain safe and readily accessible". "We remain of the opinion that opportunities exist in the financial services environment and we will continue to explore these," said Joosub.

ZIMBABWE OPPOSITION UP IN ARMS OVER 'US DOLLAR' PLAN

HARARE - Zimbabwe's opposition condemned the government's plan to print a local version of the US dollar as "madness" on Monday, as panic set in over a crippling cash short-

"The printing of bond notes will be the death knell to this economy," the main opposition party, the Movement for Democratic Change (MDC), said in a statement.

"Zimbabweans have walked this road before. They have not forgotten the dark days when they were poor quintillionnaires."

Zimbabwe adopted the US and South African currencies in 2009 after hyperinflation peaked at 231 million percent, rendering the national currency worthless.

A recent shortage of foreign notes prompted Central Bank Governor John Mangudya to unveil measures including limit-

ing withdrawals to \$1 000 per day and printing a series of tokens, called bond notes, rated at par with the US dollar. "The MDC is preparing a

robust response to this madness and the party reserves its right to mobilise the people against this ill-advised decision which is certainly not backed by economic

logic," the party said.

Bond notes will complement bond coins, which were introduced in 2014 to tackle a lack of small change.

The notes, which Mangudya said were "at design stage," will be in denominations of \$2, \$5, \$10 and \$20.

They will be backed by a \$200million support facility provided by the Afrexibank (Africa Export-Import Bank).

Mangudya's announcement last week prompted panic, with long queues of desperate depositors trying to withdraw their money at banks and automated teller machines.

Economists blame the cash shortage on lack of investment and a trade deficit which saw the country's import bill standing at \$490 million in the first quarter against \$167 million in exports.

Police surrounded the offices of the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission, in the capital Nairobi, with water cannons and baton-wielding officers in anticipation of the demonstration organised by the Coalition for Reforms and Democracy. Japeth Koome, Nairobi's police chief, warned that police would allow peaceful demonstrations but would not tolerate any breach of peace.

Court slaps life terms 'coup plotters'

NAIROBI - Burundi's Supreme Court slapped life sentences on 21 army officers involved in a supposed coup plot in May last year. The court had in January given 30-year jail terms to nine officers and sentenced eight other soldiers to five years while acquitting seven others. But prosecutors appealed the initial sentence. The decision is however, not binding as it can be appealed once more. AFP

Canada freezes aid to Mozambique government

OTTAWA - Canada has joined the IMF, World Bank and a number of countries in cutting aid to Mozambique over concerns about the country's finances.

Mozambique had more than US \$1.3 billion in undeclared debts, which raised concems among donors over its financial management. Fourteen donor agencies and countries, including the UK, Portugal and Switzerland, are freezing a portion of their development assistance.

Canada's high commissioner in Mozambique said on Twitter yesterday that general budget support has been frozen -that's aid that goes directly to Mozambique's government. Development assistance provided to NGOs and multilateral organisations like the UN remains in

place. Canada provided \$92 million to



Mozambique in 2012-2013, me last year for which statistics were provided on the Global Affairs Canada website.

A local media report in Mozambique said the minister of economy and finance spoke on Monday about fears the country will have to cut non-essential services and sell off assets if the suspension of aid lasts too long.

Bleak' outlook for drought-hit Zimbabwe

HARARE - Zimbabwe faces a growing food supply crisis, with a \$290 million shortfall in funding desperately required to feed up to 4.5 million people in need by next year, the United Nations warned.

A regional drought worsened by the El Nino weather phenomenon has hit Zimbabwe hard, with Mozambique, Malawi and Zambia also affected as thousands of cattle die, reservoirs are depleted and crops destroyed.

El Nino

"The general outlook is the food security situation in Zimbabwe from now right up to March 2017 is bleak," UN World Food Programme (WFP) Country Director Eddie Rowe said at a media briefing in Harare.

"Rains received in March-April have marginally

improved the situation. For most, however, it was too late to revive failed crops. There are quite a number of districts that are still feeling the full brunt of El Nino."

President Robert Mugabe in February declared a state of disaster in rural areas hit by drought in Zimbabwe, where the moribund economy has worsened the shortages.

JOHANNESBURG - The IEC have been wrapped over the knuckles for dragging its heels since 2003 for proper registration, an oversight which could essentially halve SA's voters.

If the Constitutional Court (ConCourt) does not overturn the Electoral Court's finding that all registered voters had to have a traceable address, more than 12 million people would have to be removed from the voters' roll, the ConCourt heard yesterday.

The legal and constitutional ramifications of postponing the Tlokwe municipality by-elections because of a defective voters' roll "imperilled" local government elections, due to be held countrywide on August 3, the Independent Electoral Commission (IEC) submitted to the ConCourt yesterday.

Wim Trengove, for the IEC, said the effect of the Electoral Court's judgment in Kham and Others v Electoral Commission and Another, meant the IEC would have to obtain the addresses of all 25.6 million registered voters who have physical addresses, regardless of when they were registered and remove from the voters' roll all the voters whose addresses are not on the roll

If the IEC did not do this, the voters' roll would be invalid, Trengove argued.

The IEC, ANC and department of cooperative governance and traditional affairs are in court hoping to have the Electoral Court's finding urgently overturned, while the DA, six inde-

pendent candidates and others are hoping the court will rule the IEC had better get a move on in registering the possibly more than 12 million voters who do not have addresses registered against their name. Trengove said after the Electoral Act had changed in 2003, it was only "implied" the IEC should keep track of voters' addresses. It was a point Chief Justice Mogoeng Mogoeng conceded when he noted it was only from November last year the IEC was required to keep addresses. The Tlokwe furore broke last year when the Electoral Court overturned the North West provinces Tlokwe by-elections because they were not free and fair, due to the voters' roll being incomplete. "Even following the two successful weekend registration drives conducted by the IEC in 2016, there remain 12.2 million registered voters

in the country without any addresses or with incomplete or generic addresses on the IEC's system," Trengove said. He added it would be impossible for the IEC to obtain the addresses of those voters before the local government elections. "The notion of 12 million registered voters being deprived of their right to vote is unthinkable," Trengove said.

The IEC came in for sharp criticism from the court for having dragged its heels since 2003 over registering voters without addresses, and a suggestion was made by Mogoeng that STATSSA become involved in supplying manpower for the registration.

Advocates struggled to come up with an answer to Mogoeng's question: "What do you want us to do?" and for the most part, said the IEC had to do its job.

However, after almost a decade of suffering, the 7ft 11in giant from a rural village in the eastern province of Shandong, has finally been offered a new lease of life.

According to on.cc, Xu, from Dong Guan Tun village, was 7ft 8in last year but he grew three inches in the space of a year to 7ft 11in.

This means he is now taller than the current official tallest man in China, Bao Xishun, who is 7ft 8in.

He has an enormous appetite and eats up to 16 buns each meal. And because he is so tall, he needs

his own custom-made furniture. However, despite his stature, Xu

hasn't walked tall since his teens.

The giant accidentally fell while playing basketball when he was 15, causing undiagnosed injuries to his legs that led to poor circulation.

Within six months, Xu started seeing swelling in his legs and sores started to develop, leading him to fall back on crutches.

His injury has also meant that Xu is entirely dependent on his parents, who also have to care for his three younger siblings.

Xu has become an enormous financial, physical and emotional burden on his parents, who are both of aver-

But now an unnamed hospital has offered Xu pro-bono surgery to relieve his condition meaning that, for the first time in over a decade, he could finally stand on his own two



SAO PAULO - Brazil's Senate forged ahead with impeachment proceedings against President Dilma Rousseff on Monday, rejecting a surprise decision by the acting speaker of the lower house, who tried to annul a key vote just days before the president could be suspended from office. The clash between Brazil's two most senior lawmakers threw markets into disarray and threatened to drag out a painful political crisis with a constitutional standoff that could end up at the Supreme Court. Controvecial Mayor leads in elections

MANILA - Firebrand city mayor Rodrigo Duterte looked virtually certain to become the Philippines' next president, with one of

his main rivals conceding he has won.

This appeared to be confirmation that the political outsider's pledges to crush crime and corruption had resonated with voters.

With 80 percent of the vote counted late on Monday night, Duterte had 13.2 million votes, about 5.5 million more than his nearest rival, according to the PPCRV, a Catholic Church-run poll monitor accredited by the government to tally the votes.

Bayan Zehlif, a 17-year-old high school senior, said at a news conference with Muslim community advocates that she found it "coincidental" that she was mistaken for a girl whose name is widely associated with a terror group. LONDON'S NEW MAYOR TO VISIT USA

LONDON - Presumptive GOP nominee Donald Trump has said that London's new mayor will be exempt from his ban on Muslims.

Trump first announced his controversial plans to bar all non-American Muslims from entering the United States in the aftermath of the San Bernardino terror attacks last December.

But as Sadiq Khan was voted the next Mayor of London last week, the real estate mogul has said he will allow 'exceptions' to the ban. "There will always be exceptions," Trump told the New York Times, adding that he was happy to see Khan become the first Muslim mayor of a western capital because he can 'lead by example'. Trump has come under heavy criticism for his stance on Muslims which critics have called discriminatory and racist.

But rather than back down from his inflammatory claims, last week Trump doubled down on his call to ban non-American Muslims from entering the United States - even if it causes problems going forward in the general election.

"They're destroying Europe, I'm

not going to let that happen to the United States," Trump said this morning during an interview on Morning Joe.

While he may be an 'exception' to the ban, Khan said he was planning to visit the US before this year's presidential elections in November 'in case Donald Trump wins.' In an interview with Time magazine, before Trump's announcement yesterday, he said: "If Donald Trump becomes the president I'll be stopped from going there by virtue of my faith, which means I can't engage with American mayors and swap ideas."

He has previously expressed admiration for mayors Bill de Blasio in New York and Rahm Emanuel in Chicago, both Democrats, and said he hoped to meet them both. Khan criticised his rival in the bid to become the next mayor, Conservative party member Zac Goldsmith, for attempting to link him with extremism. "Conservative [party] tacticians thought those sort of tactics would win London and they were wrong. I'm confident that Donald Trump's approach to politics won't win in America."

New Panama Papers data leaked

PANAMA CITY - The latest data to be leaked in connection with the Panama Papers scandal reveals the names and details of thousands of offshore companies including those of 36 Americans who have been accused of financial misconduct.

The easily searchable online database includes the names Americans who have been convicted of fraud or other crimes. Six Americans listed in the papers were accused in a lawsuit in federal court in the state of Washington for using an off-

shore company to run a
Ponzi scheme that cost thousands of middle-class
Indonesians nearly \$100 million. The names were made
available by International
Consortium of Investigative
Journalists, based on the
massive trove of information
discovered on the finances of
the rich and powerful.

The latest files to be released also contain basic corporate information about companies, trusts and foundations set up in 21 jurisdictions including Hong Kong and the US state of Nevada. The data was obtained from

Panamanian law firm Mossack Fonseca, which said it was hacked.

Among the 36 Americans are Martin Frankel, a Connecticut financier who pleaded guilty in 2002 to 20 counts of wire fraud, securities fraud and racketeering conspiracy.

Frankel became notorious for his lavish lifestyle, which included purchasing jewels, furs, luxury cars and a compound where he recruited women 'through advertisements in alternative publications'

El Chapo's extradition proceeds after prison transfer

MEXICO CITY - Joaquin 'El Chapo' Guzman is one step closer to being extradited to the US, where he has been indicted on charges of drugs and arms trafficking, money laundering and murder.

A federal judge in Mexico ruled Guzman's extradition can move forward, although the Foreign Relations Department still has 20 days to approve the decision, which can be blocked by his attorneys.

The decision comes just two days after the Sonaloa cartel boss was moved from a maximum-security prison near Mexico City to a one in Ciudad Juarez.

Mexico's Judicial Council said the judge, who it did not name, had agreed that the legal requirements laid out in the extradition treaty between the two countries had been met.

Protocol

The Foreign Relations Department has 20 days to decide whether to approve Guzman's extradition, although his attorneys can request a delay or stop the process altogether if the decision is appealed.

Guzman was moved Saturday from a prison outside Mexico City to one in Ciudad Juarez near the US border.

Mexico's National Security Commission said the transfer was in line with security protocols, and it has rotated more than 7 400 inmates nationwide as part of a security strategy implemented last September.

Questions have arisen on both sides of the border about the decision to relocate the convicted drug lord to a region that is one of his cartel's strongholds.

One Mexican security official who spoke on the condition of anonymity acknowledged Sunday that the sudden transfer was to a less-secure prison.



Bayern complete signing of Dortmund captain Hummels

MUNICH - Bayern Munich have announced their second signing of the day after taking Mats Hummels from Bundesliga rivals Borussia Dortmund for £30million.

The Germany international has long been linked with a return to the club he started his career with before leaving for Dortmund in 2009

And it was confirmed on Tuesday that the 27-year-old World Cup winner will join the recently-crowned German champoins on July 1 on a five-year deal, subject to a medical.

Carlo Ancelotti, who will take over from Pep Guardiola at the end of the season, has boosted his defensive ranks with the signing and the move has been hailed by club chief Karl-Heinz Rummenigge.

"We're delighted that Mats Hummels has decided to join Bayern," said the Bayern chairman on his club's website. "Mats is one of the best central defenders in the world and we're able to improve the quality of our team even further with him."

Hummels had one year left to run on his contract at Signal Iduna Park and had informed Dortmund recently of his desire to leave them this summer.

But the defender, who initially joined Dortmund on loan in 2008 before

sealing a permanent move the following season, has revealed his emotional attachment towards the club.

LONDON - Formula One chief Bernie Ecclestone has revealed that a Grand Prix in London could be held as early as next year.


Plans have been in the pipeline for a street race to rival Monaco for several years but the proposals have faced a number of obstacles.

Early ideas for a track have involved sections going past Hyde Park and Buckingham Palace.

Before a race can be added to the F1 calendar, however, government has to pass legislation enabling councils to close certain roads for a high-speed race.

But Ecclestone, 85, insists that a London circuit could be in place by 2017.

Neymar set to sign new Barcelona contract

BARCELONA - Neymar's new Barcelona contract will include a huge buyout clause totalling £174million in an attempt to fend off potential suitors, according to reports in Spain.

The Catalan club are desperate to keep hold of the Brazil captain and will reportedly take extreme measures to ensure he stays at the Nou Camp beyond this summer.

Neymar previously signed a five-year deal with Barcelona when he arrived from Santos in June 2013, and talks are ongo-

ing regarding a new deal through until 2021.

The front page of Spain's Mundo Deportivo newspaper on Tuesday leads with Barcelona's 'top secret' offer to Neymar, which includes an 'escape clause' of €220m (£174m) - second only to Lionel Messi at the Nou Camp. Neymar's clause now is €190m (£153m). There is optimism on all fronts that the 24-year-old will sign the improved deal, with confirmation expected before the start of next season. *Daily Mail*

JOHANNESBURG - As the Premier Soccer League marathon enters the last two laps, Golden Arrows find themselves perfectly placed for a top-eight surge.


If they were able to show the consistency that marked them as a dangerous team at the start of the season, they would not have found themselves in the lower mid-table rat race.



SOCCER - GREEN Mamba President and His Majesty's **Correctional Services Commissioner** General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase says they will definitely punish the team's officials, who were involved in the fracas with Mbabane Swallows during the SwaziBank Cup final at the Somhlolo National Stadium on Sunday.

Ntshangase said they strongly condemn unsporting behaviour during football matches and further called for sportsmanship among officials, players and fans.

"We will launch an internal investigation on the incident where both teams' officials were involved in a scuffle. We won't tolerate violence during games and the law will take its course on the individuals involved. I hope Swallows will also address the matter within their structures," he said.

Ashamed

The president said he was ashamed to see officials behaving in this manner in front of the King.

It is such behavior that chased sponsors away from the sport, he noted.

"Match officials must always strive to uphold a high level of professionalism during matches in order to curb such occurrences which are not welcome anywhere near football.

"I personally feel they should have done better in controlling the situation before it almost got out of hand," he said.

The incident erupted after Banele Dlamini rough-tackled Wonder 'Samba-Jive' Nhleko, something that saw tempers flaring between the two teams' set of officials as they exchanged heated words.

Implicated

If implicated in the match commissioners reports, the officials involved will face punishment by the Disciplinary Committee according to the rules and regulations of the 2016 SwaziBank Cup.

Mbabane Swallows CEO Sibusiso Manana said as a team they also condemned the act as it was barbaric and did not portray sportsmanship.

"We understand that tempers do flare up, especially in football matches of that nature but it is not an excuse for an occurrence of that fashion. We would like to forward our sincere apologies in as far as the incident is concerned.'
