

Rain forecast still looking good

THE seasonal outlook forecast continues to show above-normal rainfall this October till December.

This was confirmed by Swazi Met's Sifiso Nzalo yesterday. Nzalo said there was a slight

chance of normal to above-normal rainfall over most parts of the country during the October-November and December 2016 (OND)

He said this week shows that the above normal rains are slightly taking its course in the country.

He said there are high chances of rainfall, looking at the fact that

tomorrow evening there will be occasional rain drizzles and fog, otherwise cloudy with sunny intervals in the Lowveld.

Temperatures

"Temperatures are going to slightly drop till Friday," he said.

The January, February and March (JFM) 2017 period is likely to have the entire country's rainfall trend receiving towards normal-to-below normal rainfall.

SIPA CEO summons cleaners to disciplinary hearing Friday

LAST Friday Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority (SIPA) cleaners were each served with letters to appear before a disciplinary hearing this Friday on charges of leaking information to the media about mismanagement of the state corporation.

The letters stipulate they must show why disciplinary action should not be taken against them for disclosing the parastatal's inside information to the public.

They allege the letters are at the insistence of Chief Executive Officer Phumelele Dlamini.

However, the cleaners are seething with anger and point an accusing finger at their supervisors whom they suspect have been forced to file false claims as their CEO intensifies her resolve to get even with all her employees.

They also dispel media reports that at any point they admitted to leaking information to the media save for submitting 17 grievances to established structures within the organisation and these being grievances bordering on welfare and industrial issues and not secrets about the operations of SIPA.

The media report further makes reference to an interim findings report by some lawyer who purportedly led an investigation into the leaking of information.

However, the cleaners allege they have nothing to do with the compilation of 36 grievances by their counterparts at headquarters and therefore cannot be made accountable to those save for what they submitted both to the board of directors, the minister and to a Member of Parliament who raised the issue within the legislature.

The executive did not waste time and summoned the cleaners immediately after they presented their grievances and charged them with what she termed a serious breach of SIPA policies.

However the cleaners argue they last signed their contracts in the second quarter of 2014 and since then have been engaged outside the labour laws of the country and therefore cannot be held accountable to those laws.

It was for that reason they wanted other competent bodies to intervene because the CEO had also taken things on her own hands such as awarding them increments even before they could sign contracts, a blatant breach of protocol and pro-

cedure on her part.

The cleaners are also enraged by allusions they admitted before their supervisor of having leaked information to the media, saying it was either the wild imaginations of the lawyer or those of the supervisor attempting to save face before her superiors.

"How can our supervisor make statements on our behalf when we are there and report to work every morning? Even if we refused to appear before the probe it does not make the supervisor's submissions any credible," said one of the cleaners.

Classified

In essence, the cleaners argue there is highly classified information contained in the grievances that did not come from the cleaners such as the double payment of contractors, information that can never at any point fall in the hands of clean-

The other is hiring out of Hall No.2 to a private pastor for private services whose rentals are still to be accounted for.

The SIPA managers in their letter to the minister alleged their CEO created a non-workable environment in the institution by her leadership style and have requested government to act up to prevent the organisation from failing to deliver on its mandate to attract investors to the country.

They accused the CEO of using abusive and belittling language against senior managers in front of junior staff and investors and it has rendered them unable to perform their duties.

They have also accused her of flouting a lot of procedures ranging

from procurement and sidelining managers by engaging junior staff for managerial duties. These allegations are in a letter to the minister of February 23. Instead of looking into the grievances the CEO jumped to institute a commission of enquiry that was otherwise dubbed a witch hunt. The instruction to establish the commission of inquiry had initially been directed to the SIPA board of directors, which was however, sacked sometime in May 2016 and replaced by the current board chaired by Sandile Simelane.

This board called upon the employees to submit their grievances against the CEO and a report had already been submitted to the board for consideration.

The CEO was also accused of micro managing even the smallest of tasks, which removed authority from the relevant managers, but later held them accountable.

She was further reported to have sidelined the human resource manager or line manager of a particular employee when transferring them to other departments or varying their

This, the employees said, impacted negatively to the organisation because she failed to consider relevance of that employee in the new department and statutory require-

Another allegation is the CEO was entitled to approve tenders worth up to E500 000, otherwise the audit committee has to be involved on tenders for projects beyond that

However, Dlamini is alleged to have interfered on tenders whose costs were above her threshold.

She is alleged to have authorised a E981 565 000 tender for the rehabilitation of Taitex factory shell in Matsapha, by arguing the project should be done in phases since the budget was not supposed to exceed E500 000.

The cleaners say they cannot possibly possess so much detail about her alleged mismanagement.

They stick to the 17 grievances they directed to the board and the minister, these being institutions directly linked to the operations of

They also accuse her of defying her own board and also accusing one of her superiors, the ministers yet she is bent on forcing cleaners to jump all the structures and appear before her instead of their supervisors who also must be within the established regulations that govern the flow of authority at the institu-

SUSPENDED LIMKOKWING STUDENTS RUN TO MPS

SUSPENDED Limkokwing Students Representatives Council executive members, are intensely lobbying parliamentarians to intervene on the ongoing dispute between them and the university administration.

The SRC executive made a very convincing presentation to parliamentarians yesterday, detailing alleged injustice they were being subjected to at the institution, including their suspension and subsequent prevention from coming anywhere near the university.

in parliament last week, the students embarked on the process to lobby the legislators to consider, as part of their intervention, conducting their own investigation in the institution to see for themselves the harsh conditions they were subjected to everyday.

Conducive

The students said the environment was far from being conducive for learning, citing various factors which they believed were contributing to the current state of affairs.

The meeting between the student body executive and the parliamentarians took place at the Sibane Hotel shortly after the completion of a workshop that was organised by the

parliamentarians. The MPs were told that the students' problems in the institution had been going on for a very long time now, dating back to the previous SRC executive which reportedly took up the students' concerns with the ministries of labour and social security as well as that of education and training.

The students said as a university of innovation, Limkokwing students should be able to access internet services but such services had been top of their agenda of challenges they faced since 2014. They said they were told they had since used the last bundle of units from SPTC which were provided by government.

THE troubles that are reportedly engulfing the Mbabane based Limkokwing University centres around poor admission policies, the SRC executive has alleged.

Addressing parliamentarians at Sibane Hotel, the SRC executive said so unbearable the situation at the university that students scrambled for chairs and other facilities which should otherwise be easily accessible to students had the institution been operating normally. The student executives said some students attend to lectures and spend the whole session standing. To get a chair, the same thing applied, students scramble for them and only those able to

luxury of having a lecture on a chair. The parliamentarians were told the problems extends to class room shortages and accommodation at the formerly Castle Hotel which was converted into a university residence. Rooms that were designed to accommodate three students are now allegedly packed to capacity with six students per room, said the SRC executive. The students concerns included that poorly qualified lecturers were engaged by the institution. Some of the contracted lectures reportedly graduated with Associate Degrees in 2015 and have no work experience.

calls for calm Ntfonjeni MP

"I nearly died inside my car after a gate came flying and almost smashed my car," said Ntfonjeni Member of **Parliament Sompisi** Magagula.

In his desperate plea to the students for calm and patience, MP Magagula said no matter how aggrieved they were, it remained paramount for them to ensure safety of innocent members of the public was guaranteed.

He told the students he had absolutely done nothing wrong on the day in question and his only sin was to be at a wrong place at a wrong time, hence he became a victim of circumstances.

The unfortunate incident, Magagula said, occurred during one of the student protests at their university campus at Sidvwashini in Mbabane.

Had he been unable to immediately apply his car's brakes, he would have died on the spot despite having done no wrong. The SRC executive is currently on suspension pending their appearing before a disciplinary committee for a hearing.

In the interim, however, they have been slapped with a restraining order to stay at least 100 metres away from the institution.

PAC will miss newly appointed ministers

THE Public Accounts Committee (PAC) will miss the valuable contribution that was brought by the two recently-appointed ministers.

PAC members have congratulated the two on the appointments into their new positions. However, they stated their departure from the PAC would somehow affect the work of the committee because they had brought in a massive wealth of experience to the committee.

Manzini South Member of Parliament (MP) Owen Nxumalo and Mafutseni MP Christopher Gamedze were swornin on Monday at Cabinet offices in Mbabane

Nxumalo is now the Public Service Minister while Gamedze will head the Tourism Ministry.

PAC Chairperson Thuli Dladla thanked His Majesty King Mswati III for appointing them to be ministers.

She stated that she would miss their expertise, which made the PAC function properly. Dladla said she worked with them for sometime both in the PAC and as backbenchers.

She described them as hard workers who were dedicated in their responsibilities. She said their outstanding attributes included reliability because they would attend PAC meetings, without compromising the quorum.

Dladla said they would also interrogate issues during the hearings, without fear or favour. The new ministers would also stay throughout the hearings, despite the long session. At times, they would leave the chambers at midnight. However, the chairperson pointed out that she would sometimes receive protests during such incidents.

Oualifications

"Their tertiary qualifications and experience in the accounting field will not go unnoticed in their contributions during PAC hearings. I will miss them in my capacity as the chairperson of the PAC and that of the prime minister's portfolio committee," Dladla said.

The chairperson also highlighted that even in Parliament, the two would always actively avail themselves to workshops on bills and any other parliament meetings. She singled out Gamedze as one MP who would send an apology when he was not able to attend.

PAC Deputy Chairperson Phila Buthelezi also pointed out that the PAC would be affected by the departure of the two MPs.

"We lost a lot as a result of the departure of the two MPs. They have a rich background in finance and accounting and they made our work as PAC a lot easier. Now we have to close the vacancies created by their departure

and sometimes this takes a long time to happen," Buthelezi said.

Buthelezi's sentiments were shared by Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe, who is also a member of the PAC. "We have lost two great politicians at PAC as they were both zealous about their work," Shongwe said.

However, Shongwe wished them all their best in their new positions as ministers.

Shiselweni II MP Mthokozisi Kunene, however, was of the view that the PAC would not be much affected by the departure of the two MPs.

"I think the work of the PAC will now be much easier because the two MPs will now be able to quickly sort out any wrongdoings within government, without having to be seen by Parliament," Kunene said.

He said government and Parliament worked in close cooperation to move the country forward.

Armed police deployed at Limko

STUDENTS at the Limkokwing University said they were intimidated by an alleged heavy presence of armed police officers in every corner of the institution.

The police presence, the SRC executive believes, is an intimidation tactic used by the university administration to instill fear amongst the students to prevent them from joining their leaders who are on suspension.

Disallowed

The SRC executive told parliamentarians they were currently disallowed to enter the university campus and therefore were camped by the gate, at least 100 metres away to avoid violating a restraining order issued against them to that effect.

80 tons of mealie-meal smuggled into SD monthly

AN estimated 80 tons of

mealie-meal is smuggled into the country monthly. NAMBoard Chief Executive Officer Siphephiso Dlamini made the revelations while warning members of parliament that to open the gates for unrestricted importation of mealie-meal and other grain products would

destroy the country's fragile economy.

Explaining why the market was restricted, Dlamini said that was a form of protecting the local economy from outside giants who could easily flood their products and ultimately kill the agricultural industry locally.

Increase on importation, doubled with the smuggled products, would definitely render the Swazi economy completely non-functional,

said Dlamini.

Dlamini said all the challenges faced were a result of the country's failure to produce enough maize and other products for the local market.

The deficits, Dlamini said, warranted that the National Maize Corporation (NMC) continued to import maize.

NMC Chief executive Officer Dumsani Msibi concurred with Dlamini, further emphasising that the government parastatal had a duty to ensure the grain was at all times available locally and controlled the price as well.

Lugongolweni MP Joseph Sousa demanded answers on what the parastatals were doing to ensure they mitigated the situation and improved local production as opposed to supporting the foreign market, especially South African farmers who were main producers of maize.



SUSPECT KILLER TEACHER SENT TO SIDWASHINI

THE teacher accused of murdering his wife and setting her alight inside their family car, Themba Masimula, made his second appearance yesterday before court whereby, through his lawyer, he made it clear he was not ready to go

back to police custody.

This follows a submission by the Crown Counsel to re-apply to have the suspect kept under police custody after he spent the whole day in hospital yesterday. "None of our objectives were met Your Worship as the accused person was in hospital the whole day, so we are asking to re-apply for another 24 hours as investigations have to proceed," Masango said. He further mentioned that his concern was the accused would not be accepted at the Correctional Services due to his condition. "He has to be fully fit; we ask to keep him until we are sure he is fit enough. We will keep him at Mbabane Government Hospital as they do have holding cells there and a doctor will attend to him until he is ok," Masango added.

However, Masimula's lawyer Noncedo Ndlangamandla opposed this move.

Nhlabatsi then ordered the suspect to be sent to the Correctional Services until October 20. The suspect came back a different man in court as he spotted bandages all over his face and hands. He was also bare-footed this time around while also limping. Moreover, more people came to support him when he made his appearance at around 3:30pm. After the order was granted, he left the court and chatted with his lawyer and some of the people who came to support him before he was taken away in a van.

KING PRAISES TAIWANESE FOR UPLIFTING SWAZIS

HIS Majesty King Mswati III is full of praise for the Republic of China on Taiwan for its critical role in uplifting the living standards of Swazis.

2 women busted red-handed stealing 4 Milos

TWO women were yesterday afternoon busted redhanded stealing four bottles of Milo by the shop owner at Smile Supermarket in Mbabane.

According to the shop owner Irfar Makkan, the thieving pair entered his shop at around 13:45 hours and took a shopping basket like normal customers do.

He said he started noting that the two were up to not good, when they started wondering aimlessly inside the shop. He then watched their every move on the closed-circuit television (CCTV) monitor located at the counter.

"Along the food aisle they spent about 30 minutes at one spot and that's when I became even more suspicious of them. When they moved from that aisle they started taking random groceries around the shop and headed for the paying till. All this time the pair was still walking together carrying on as if they were normal customers," he said.

Makkan said when they got to the paying till they dropped the grocery baskets they were carrying and headed for the door. He then stopped them on their hills and ordered his female staff to conduct a frisk search on them. He said to confirm his suspicion the two were found hiding Milos underneath their shirts.

One unidentified woman was found with three Milo containers stuffed around her waist tightened by leggings. The other one, identified as Busisiwe Dlamini (33), was also found with one Milo container also tucked around her waist tightened by leggings as well. The shop owner said he quickly called the police hotline '999' and asked the officers to respond to his shop and they swiftly did.

The two ladies were found quarrelling amongst themselves with the unidentified woman blaming Dlamini for convincing her to steal from the shop. "You made me steal, I told you we must just leave the shop but you kept on saying we must take the stuff," she was heard saying.

Upon realising they were photographed, Busisiwe turned violent and assaulted the news reporter while trying to block the camera on her way out of the supermarket to board the police van.

The two are expected to appear before court today.

TRAFFIC came to a standstill at Malagwane Hill yesterday when a truck transporting timber spilt its cargo all over the road thus blocking the on-coming vehi-

The incident occurred around 2pm when Melusi Sibiya, 25, of South Africa lost control of the truck, which he said he failed to balance properly on the steep hill.

Interviewed after the accident, Sibiya said the cause for the accident was his failure to balance the truck as he was climbing the Malagwane Hill.

No one was injured during the incident save that it caused traffic congestion as they tried to remove the spilt timber from the road.

"I am still shocked on what happened because I tried to control the truck but failed as in the process it got a puncture on the wheels and it took almost two hours to clear







E26m or we strike again, orderlies tell government

HOSPITAL orderlies have vowed to bring all public health institutions to a standstill again should government not pay their arrear salaries by the end of this month.

The orderlies, from all public institutions in the country, won a court order that was confirmed by the Supreme Court that government should upgrade their salary grade from A2 to A4.

The Supreme Court had issued the order in June 2016, but nothing was done until the orderlies engaged in a protest action to force compliance.

The ministry of health, in court papers, has said it would need a budget of about E26 million to comply with the order. Government, last week instituted legal proceedings against the orderlies to stop them from engaging in the protest action. The Industrial Court issued an interim order barring the employees from engaging in the industrial action.

Filing

The matter was postponed to October 28.

The parties were on Monday at the Industrial Court again to be put to terms on the filing of papers and allocate hearing dates.

The orderlies, after that, convened a brief meeting where they were addressed by Lucky Msibi,

who expressed concern that government was delaying complying with the court order.

"We will wait until October 28 to see what government puts on offer. If nothing is done, we will down tools again on October 29," he told the gathering.

He stated they deserved the salary upgrade

Pains

When interviewed yesterday, Msibi stated that orderlies were at pains on government's non-compliance with the court order. He said the orderlies needed the money and it was painful they were made to earn meagre salaries yet they know they deserve better and the courts allocated them.

He stated they would wait to see

what turns out in court on the day and decide on the next move. He stated that the upgrade on their salaries would see them earning an increment of more than E1 000 each, depending on the salary notch one is in. He stated that a hospital orderly on A2 notch 1 earned about E4 400 and the A4 notch one grade attracted about E5 700 per month.

Industrial Court Judge Dumisani Mazibuko had advised government to solve the issue by at least paying half the amount owed to the employees.

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Health Dr Simon Zwane said they had asked Cabinet to assist in the matter.

He also said they filed a request for a supplementary budget.

Include Emabandla in parastatals' decision making - Bennett

BUSINESSMAN Walter Bennett has advised government parastatals to include councils (Emabandla) in key decision making positions to avoid negative repercussions in cases of retrench-

Bennett's advice stems from the impending Swaziland Post and

Telecommunication Corporation's workshop on the unbundling of the parastatal.

He said the past has proven that when parastatals undertake a retrenchment exercise, chances of the cases of unsatisfied ex-employees ending up with the councils are high. It was therefore imperative that the parastatals should consider involving the councils at the preliminary stage of retrenchment exercises.

'Emabandla should also be invited in these kinds of workshops so they could put forward their views since by now they are aware of the major issues that go wrong in cases of retrenchments. Their input could be very valuable and it would also help avoid a lot of people seeking interventions from the various councils," he said. Bennett said the various emabandla were very important in stabilising the country. He made an example of the Municipal Council of Mbabane which has just retrenched some of its employees saying some amongst them were unhappy with the

payout received. "The ex-employees will be soon going to seek intervention from the councils yet had they been involved when the process was at the preliminary stage, they would have made great input which would have avoided the unsatisfied lot," he said.

Cop dumps her senior cop husband

A senior police officer's bid to save his marriage with his colleague, seemed to fall on deaf ears as she told him in court she wanted out.

Inspector Sicelo Dlamini was defending his wife Nombulelo Bhembe's application before the High Court who was seeking an order cancelling their Swazi customary law marriage.

Bhembe, a Sergeant in the police service, filed the application before the High Court, claiming their families had resolved that the marriage should be cancelled after it went sour. She claimed her husband engaged in many love relationships and also physically abused

Bhembe informed the court she

September 21, 2001 at his homestead at Esitsheni. Soon after her marriage with Dlamini, she was enrolled at the Police College in Matsapha. They thereafter stayed together at the Police Camp in Siteki, but were later transferred to different police stations.

She claimed that all was rosy for a period of five years and he thereafter changed his behaviour. She alleged he got involved in many love relationships, but accused her of cheating on him.

"He would assault, insult me and this happened for the better part of the period we stayed together. A number of meetings between the families were convened where I reported him for assaulting me. He would even assault me for having reported him to my family. On February 10, 2008, the families met and it was resolved that the marriage should be dissolved," Bhembe said.

She was leading evidence before High Court Judge Qinisile Mabuza and was represented by Advocate Mduduzi 'Tsotsi' Mabila on instruction from lawyer Linda Dlamini from Mabila Attorneys.

Dlamini was represented by lawyer Thulani Mamba from Mkhwanazi Attorneys in the matter. Mamba cross examined Bhembe and said Sicelo would deny that the families had met and resolved to have the marriage dissolved.

However, Bhembe maintained her stance and claimed the meeting had been held at Esitsheni where one Inkhosikati LaMtsetfwa had stated that due to the differences between the two, the marriage should be dis-

solved. Mamba stated that his client would deny he ever assaulted her. He also said Sicelo would tell the court, when leading evidence,

that the various meetings convened by the two parties' families were aimed at resolving their differences, including that he was dating women, not to end their marriage. Again, Bhembe denied this and stated she had witnesses, such as her uncles who had been part of those meetings. However, she maintained that the meetings were aimed at reporting her husband for the alleged assault.

"The defendant will tell the court he still loves you and does not want to separate with you. Not today or any other day, Sicelo's lawyer told Bhembe.

Bhembe first paused briefly before saying; she could not define the assault in Sicelo's hands as being loved. "My wish is to cancel the marriage certificate," she said.

She stated that she and her husband had been living separately since 2008. She also had heard that Dlamini had married another woman, but has never met her. The matter was postponed indefinitely for continuation.

000 FINE FOR SLAPPING

A 27-year-old soccer fan learnt the hard way after he assaulted a female police officer on duty during a soccer match at Somhlolo National Stadium

The act has set the soccer fan back by E5 000, which was a fine handed by Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi yesterday. The Mbabane Magistrate's Court learnt that Mancoba Matsenjwa lost his cool and slapped Constable Ncobile Dlamini twice on her face after she came in between Matsenjwa and his girlfriend.

It is alleged the couple was involved in a lengthy fight after taking one too many at the stadium on Sunday afternoon. It is alleged the police officer, who was on duty on the day of the incident, saw it fit to try and separate

However, she allegedly got more than what she bargained for as she received two hot slaps from the drunk and aggressive soccer fan. This then led to Matsenjwa being charged with the offence of assault common by the Lobamba police.

The incident happened at around 5:50pm at or near the national stadium after the two soccer games that played on the day had concluded.

While making his appearance before court, Matsenjwa blamed alcohol for his actions. He further alleged he realised late that the

woman he was slapping was actually a police officer doing her work as she was on duty.

"She found me fighting with my girlfriend. I slapped her by mistake as I did not see she was a police officer, actually, I was too drunk," Matsenjwa said. He said this after Nhlabatsi needed to know what made the offender assault a uniformed police officer.

However, Matsenjwa pleaded guilty to the offence, which resulted in the court convicting him. He was found guilty as per his own plea.

During mitigation, Matsenjwa asked the court to be lenient with him as he was still young. "I acted childishly and am sorry for my actions. It will not happen again," he said.

Nhlabatsi sentenced him to pay a fine of E5 000 or spend five years in jail. However, two years or E2 000 from the fine was suspended for three years on condition he must not be found to have committed a similar or any offence.

Suspect killer teacher needs counselling

THE teacher suspected to have murdered his wife and set her alight inside their family car, alleged he was in need of professional counselling.

Themba Masimula revealed this when making his first appearance at the Mbabane Magistrate's Court on Monday, where the Crown Counsel moved an application that he be kept under police custody, at least until Friday.

The main reason advanced by Buddy Masango, who represented the Crown, was that investigations were still underway while adding the matter needed to be treated differently from other previous criminal cases.

On the other hand, Masimula alleged he was having a hard time dealing with the troubles currently facing him.

Among several reasons, he alleged he lost his father in a car accident about four hours after losing his wife.

While spotting visible injuries on his face, hands and legs, Masimula further made allegations that since the police took him under their custody on Saturday, he has been denied an opportunity to go to hospital.

"I do not even know the charge I am facing as no one has communicated anything to me regarding that. I also do not have an access to a phone, thus making things difficult for me to engage the services of an attorney.

The death of both my wife and father is

making life difficult for me hence I ask the court to consider helping me get professional counselling," Masimula said.

Masimula further told the court the interrogation had worsened things for him as it was not only disturbing but also gave the public an opportunity to judge him.

"I was also involved in the same accident that took away my wife's life and the large number of police officers visiting both my homes while conducting their investigations has left me to be viewed as a killer by the court of public opinion.

The newspapers as well are flooded with stories about this, so I need to move on to the next stage so I do not want to be kept under police custody anymore," he added.


But Masango, who is the Crown Counsel. told the court that something was still not adding up in the investigations hence their request to have more time with the suspect.

"We need to find out what really transpired here. We cannot afford to treat this matter in like manner with others.

The Crown would suffer greatly in terms of finding the truth if this matter would be dealt with the normal way, so in order for justice to be served we apply that the accused be kept under police custody," Masango said.

Masango added that the suspect was misinforming the court about the allegations he was denied an opportunity to go to hospital.

He revealed all this after Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi demanded clear explanation as to why she should grant them the application to keep the suspect with the

police way more than the stipulated time.

After a court adjournment, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi granted the Crown Counsel their wish of keeping Masimula under the police custody until yesterday, even though the suspect had initially objected to the application.

Nhlabatsi further told the suspect he was facing a charge of murder following suspicions that he played a role in the death of his wife.

...Police cells conditions unbearable

THEMBA Masimula has said life at the police holding cells was not rosy for him and he was not looking forward to spending more than 48 hours

He then asked the court to move to the next level as he alleged the interrogation stage was now done, according to him. He further told the court he needed to be in charge of his father's funeral arrangements as he was the first born at home.

He then asked the court to give him a chance to contact his lawyer as he alleged he was being denied access to his legal representative while under the police custody.

After the matter was stood down for more than one hour 30 minutes, Masimula came back without a lawyer and claimed he was only given a phone four minutes before the court's time to find himself a legal counsel.

However, his lawyer Noncedo Ndlangamandla emerged and asked the court that her client did not want to be seen as uncooperative with the police but feared torture at their hands while being interrogated.

The Crown Counsel assured the court that the suspect would not be tortured in the hands of the police as they to do so aware they were aware it was unlawful.

Suspension of Makhewu indvuna leaves residents in dilemma

THE suspension of Makhewu Indvuna Sigwili Nkonyane, has left residents of the area undecided as to whether to continue attending meetings chaired by him or not.

Makhewu is one of the largest communities under KaLanga Chiefdom. Nkonyane and his entire council were sus-

pended by Acting Chief Rudolf Maziya last

The suspension was communicated to the residents during a community meeting, which was held at the community hall.

Nkonyane and his council were suspended following allegations they were illegally allocating land to new settlers without consulting with the acting chief.

Knowledge

The council was also accused of conducting a number of other projects which would at some instances require residents to make monetary contributions without the knowledge of the acting chief.

Confusion started when another faction arrived at the same community hall a week later and nullified the suspension of the inner council.

The faction is said to have been led by Mandla Maziya, who is regarded as a senior member of the chiefdom's royal family (umntfwanenkhosi lomkhulu).

This is the same faction which has over the years been at loggerheads with the appointed authorities of the area.

Mandla has been contesting the appointment of the acting chief, saying he was not endorsed by the elders of the family.

Mandla allegedly stated the elders of the Maziya family still recognised Nkonyane as the rightful Indvuna of Makhewu.

This is what has left residents of the area confused as to which of the two parties should be obeyed.

When he was also quizzed by this publication on whether he did visit the community hall to 'nullify' the acting chief's order, Mandla confirmed to have done so.

Concerned

He stated that as far as the elders of the Maziya family were concerned, Nkonyane was still a legitimate Indvuna of Makhewu.

"It is true that we visited the community hall on Saturday to give a green light to Nkonyane to proceed with his duties as an Indvuna, said Mandla. Meanwhile, Mandla and other family members have on several occasions appeared before Lubombo Regional Administrator Sylvia Mthethwa after they were reported to be disobeying the acting chief. At some instance, they were reported for having conducted renovations at the umphakatsi without consulting the acting chief.

On this particular case, the RA ruled that Mandla and his siblings (children to the late Chief Mlimi Maziya) must always seek permission from the acting chief whenever they wanted to do anything concerning the umphakatsi.

Cops assaulted, fabricated charges against me - dagga accused

A man has claimed he was assaulted by arresting police officers who later fabricated the charges against him to make them appear more severe.

Bheki Mabuza (27) from Buhleni claimed he was assaulted by the arresting police officers who took him to a secluded forest, and beat him all over the body with fists and kicks

He said after the beatings the policeman then took him back to the Buhleni police station for more

beatings and fabricated the charges.

Mabuza had appeared before

Mabuza had appeared before Pigg's Peak Magistrate Simangele Mbatha.

He said the police originally arrested him for the possession of dagga weighing 1.2 kilograms which was found at his home at Buhleni.

However, the police later changed the charge and said he was in possession of dagga weighing 4.2kg, and that was the fabrication.

"The police caught me with 1.2 kg of dagga at my homestead in Buhleni and instead of taking me straight to the Buhleni police station, they took me to a secluded for-

est where one of them started assaulting me and demanded other sacks of dagga," he said before Mbatha.

Mabuza claimed the arresting police officers were working with other local dagga dealers who wanted to take his dagga stock.

"The arresting police officers are working with local dagga dealers who thought I had more dagga instead of the one they found," he said. Mabuza said the arresting police officer then refused to take him to the Pigg's Peak government hospital to receive treatment for the assault.

They also refused to open a case

of assault against the police.

Magistrate Mbatha informed Mabuza he should write a letter to the Pigg's Peak station commander and ask that he investigate the allegations of assault by the arresting police officers.

She said if no help was offered, Mabuza should then write to the regional commander informing him about the issue and if that also bear no fruit, Mabuza should then write a letter to the commissioner of police to investigate the matter.

"As of this very moment, I will order one of the police to take you to the Pigg's Peak government hospital so you have a medical check-

up and you are expected back to the court room on Friday," the magistrate said.

140 residents refunded as power scheme fails

MEMBERS of an electricity scheme project at Mathendele Township learned with shock and disappointment when they were informed they will not have electricity any time soon.

About 140 residents mostly being those living in the informal settlement were hoping to have electricity in their houses before the end of this year.

However, such is not going to happen as the project has not been considered despite being earlier assured by someone who is in the Inkhundla committee council the project would be considered and also get funding.

The members of the scheme on Saturday were refunded money they contributed towards the project.

Agreed

It had been agreed each homestead would make a contribution of E700 which was part of a certain percentage of the amount needed to be raised.

Members of the Mathendele Electricity Scheme are now angry and demand explanations on why they would not be getting connected to power yet they were assured such a project would benefit them.

"Today (Saturday) we were refunded the money which we were advised to raise as a requirement to meet the sponsor half way. We wonder what has happened as we thought all was in place. The sad part

is the person who is part of the inkhunndla council team no longer frequents the area though he was a common feature before elections. It's the same person we feel should come forward to tell us what he has achieved for us or the township in general. He is owing us an explanation as we feel he has taken us for a ride by making empty promises," one of the residents said.

The members of the scheme said it was easy to tell the project would not take off anytime soon as long as the person 'frustrating' the project was still in office.

Service

"Electricity is what we need and it's a service that is on demand. We should have not been allowed to start the scheme if the project was not going to succeed. Someone decided to make us fools and now he is dodging us. The committee of the scheme decided to refund us our money and this was after it realised nothing is going to materialise," said one of the members.

Bucopho of the area Brigs Hlatshwako said he was aware of the said electricity scheme, adding he would consult further on its progress.

"I am aware of the electricity scheme but as to what are the latest regarding it, I don't have any idea.

I have to find out from one of the members of the committee as to what happened. Right now, I don't have anything to say," said the bucopho.

Proparty damaged as father, son fight

A father and his son put a major spectacle when they were involved in a fierce fight, waking their family members and neigbours.

It is still not clear as to what sparked the fight between Mese Zwane and his elder son Comfort, of Sigcineni near Sidvokodvo who allegedly caused a scene while other family members were asleep.

It's said it was when Zwane senior went to his son's house and when outside, he started verbally attacking him.

The son did not pay attention to that and remained in bed, hoping his father would go back to sleep.

Whilst he was still hoping his father would leave, he heard windows of his house breaking as the enraged father pelted them with hard objects his hands laid on.

He continued shouting and demanded his son should leave as this was his home so he no longer wanted him.

It is said upon realising his father was vandalising his house, Comfort then came out and started verbally attacking his father as well.

The windows were broken into pieces and Comfort resorted to revenging by damaging his father's house. His father tried to stop him from doing further damage, but he failed.

It is said chaos at the homestead ensued when the two manhandled each other and a lot of noise engulfed the place with neigbours waking up to witness the drama.

"It has become a norm for them to confront each other, but on this particular day, it was terrible. The two argue even over petty issues and the next day they make up.

However, on this fateful night, the homestead was turned to a battle field and it almost resulted to blood being spilled," one neigbour said.

It is said the following morning, police from Sidvokodvo arrived at the homestead to find out what had taken place the previous night.

Police were keen to arrest the two but the family members made a request they should leave this to them as they would discuss it at family level.

"Police arrived at the Zwane homestead the following morning and the intention was to arrest the father and his son, however, close relatives appealed to the police and insisted they would drum sense the two. Police understood and left without arresting anyone," said a neighbour.

JUDGES SHOULD NOT THROW AWAY COURT CASES AND HIDE ON LACK OF JURISDICTION

HIGH Court Judge Qinisile Mabuza has said the High Court has original jurisdiction to hear all cases, even if they are traditional matters.

She says Judges should not shun their responsibilities and turn people away on the grounds the courts do not have powers to deal with certain cases.

The judge says the High Court is empowered by the constitution to hear all cases, unless those matters involve matters of chiefs which should be dealt with by the King or if they involve the installation of Headmen they are dealt with by traditional structures.

She made the statement Monday when she was hearing a case of a woman who filed an application to have her marriage declared to have been cancelled.

The woman was married to her husband in Swazi customary law. When the matter was heard Monday, the husband's lawyer raised a point of law that

the High Court did not have jurisdiction to hear the matter because the marriage had been entered into in Swazi law and custom.

However, the judge threw away the argument. She said she had issued a judgment sometime back where she

stated the High Court had original jurisdiction over all cases.

"Judges should not shun their responsibilities. If they throw away a case, they should state which body should deal with the matter. In some cases you find people's rights are trampled upon and the courts throw their cases away," she said.

Dealt

She said if it is a case that would need to be dealt with by the traditional structures; the courts would accordingly refer them to those forums.

She said for instance, if it is a case involving the installation of a chief, headman or allocation of land that case is to be referred to the relevant traditional structure. However, she said, if there are disputes in those cases, the courts have jurisdiction to entertain them. "We all stay in town and if the many cases are thrown out it means only a small percentage of the people's cases are heard. *Bandlancane* (Inner council) for instance is not trained on issues involving estates," the judge said.

Man arrested for kidnapping ex-girlfriend from new lover

A man of Lubulini has narrated before the court how another individual invaded his house and forcefully took away his newlyfound girlfriend after beating him to a pulp. This was during the case of Dumsani Xaba (30) who was charged with house breaking with intent to commit robbery and kidnapping. He was further charged with kidnapping and rape.

According to the charge sheet, the accused was alleged to have broken into a house belonging to Lungelo Nyawo where he proceeded to steal

sneakers valued at E900.

At the time when he broke into the house, it was occupied by Nyawo's girlfriend who was also a mother of a child fathered by the accused person.

This was after the accused had separated with the woman.

Upon gaining entry at the house and further stealing the sneakers,

the accused allegedly forcefully took away the woman who had come to visit her new lover. He is said to have taken the woman to his house where he sexually harassed her.

He allegedly used force and suffocated the woman by immersing her in a river. The accused made his appearance before Principal Magistrate Dumsani Magagula on Monday for commencement of trial.

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused pleaded not guilty to all three counts.

The new boyfriend was then called in as a witness in the matter.

Nyawo told the court he also got a thorough beating from the accused person before he went away with the woman. He said he was aware of a past relationship between his new girlfriend and the accused person. But the accused had recently parted ways with the woman, he stated.

The witness said the accused broke into his house through the window and took away the woman. He said the accused claimed to be still in a relationship with the woman.

The matter was eventually postponed to next Monday for continuation of trial.


EVERREADY: Former Timphisini MP Jennifer Du Pont.

FORM FIVE EKUDVWALENI PUPIL WRITES EXAMS IN HOSPITAL

IN a rather sad note, a Form Five pupil has been involved in a car accident just when she had started writing the 2016 external examinations.

She was admitted at the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital female ward

The 17-year-old minor from Buhleni was burdened with the unfortunate task of writing her end of year external examinations whilst being admitted and on pain killers at the hospital.

The girl is a pupil at Ekudvwaleni High School in the Northern Hhohho and has been hospitalised since Saturday.

The pupil said the car accident happened on the road between Buhleni and Mtsaweni on Saturday after-

She suffered face and chest abrasions but no fractures or concussions but the abrasions were serious enough to result in her being admitted to the government hospital for VI treatment.

"I cannot remember the full details of the accident, all I know is I am forced to write my examinations while admitted and sometimes I want to fall asleep while writing," she said.

The pupil stated she wrote Monday's and yesterday's papers at the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital conference room while under medication that made her

ication that sometimes makes me feel drowsy and sleepy.

Concentration is a problem, also it is hard to study in the ward as I have a Study about but cannot always follow it because I need to sleep," she said. One of the nurses at the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital outpatient department (OPD) confirmed that the pupil was receiving medication and required rest.

"The child needs to rest not write exams as examinations are a stressful time to any pupil so the child should be healing not writing."

One of the teachers from Ekudvwaleni High School, who refused to be identified, stated it was not the first time a pupil has written an examination under such circumstances

"This is not the first time this has happened, in the past we have had similar instances. We cannot stop pupils from writing their examinations because we are required to distribute all copies of the exam papers as soon as we get them so if a pupil cannot write for whatever reason he or she is disqualified and will have to take the exam the following year," the teacher said. The teacher said he understood the stress that the pupil was going through but unfortunately nothing could be done.

"Unfortunately external examinations have rules and regulations that we have to abide with. If the examination was from the school itself, then we would wait for the pupil to recuperate then join us for the exams but unfortunately this is an external examination so there is nothing we can do." The pupil will continue writing her exams at the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital until today.

Dagga dealers work in networks

DAGGA dealers have created hidden networks to protect themselves not only from the police but their counterparts.

It is said competition to sell dagga is quite high these days.

A self-confessed dagga dealer from Lomshiyo said he sold his produce at the Pigg's Peak and Mbabane bus ranks.

"Lomshiyo is good for dagga dealing in all its forms from selling, growing, and using but not just anyone can start growing dagga if you are not under protection from a network of other dealers," the dealer said.

The dealer stated that competition for selling dagga was high, so sometimes a dealer could steal produce from another if the garden was not protected. In some instances, a dealer could call the police on another dagga dealer thus eliminating the competition in the process.

"In order to make more money, one dealer would locate another dealer's garden and wait for the produce to grow once grown, the dealer would then steal as many plants as possible to either transplant elsewhere or to sell. The dealer could call the police and act as an informant," the dealer said.

The dealer stated that the gardens need to be protected by a network of other dealers who worked together to keep watch over these.

"The best way to work in the business of dagga is to be involved in a hidden network of other dealers who will pro-

vide you with protection if the police arrest you. Your friends in the network will bail you out as they usually have E2 000 saved as bail money and your friends will help you protect your garden," he said.

The dealer further stated that the location of the gardens was very important as all the land was owned by someone.

Even the distant forests belonged to individuals or companies who had at least some sort of security measure in place to protect the land against intrusion.

A senior police officer in Pigg's Peak said the networking system was an old one and was not only employed at Lomshiyo but all over Northern Hhohho.

"It is true there is competition amongst the dealers who work together as unofficial teams to buy, sell and grow dagga.

The dagga dealers' main target is for the produce to reach the lucrative South African market," the policeman said.

Acting Police Chief Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati could not confirm dagga dealers organised themselves in networks but stated the high number of dagga dealers obviously meant there was some sort of competition.

"We cannot confirm the networks but we aware there is a large number of dealers so there could be competition for sales," she said.

Man fined E1 200 for not fastening seatbelt, causing accident

A man has been fined E1 200

Zweli Lukhele (22) from Buhleni was arrested after he failed to put on his seatbelt and then resisted arrest, further causing an accident in the process.

The incident happened late on Sunday evening along the MR1 public road at Pigg's Peak, close to the police station.

He appeared before Pigg's Peak Magistrate Simangele Mbatha. He was reportedly driving out of

Pigg's Peak town from Highlands for not wearing a seatbelt and linn when he came across a police road block that caught him by surprise thus startling him and he sped off.

Speeding

"I was driving out of Pigg's Peak towards Ngonini when out of nowhere I came across a police road block and I did not see them signalling me to stop so I continued driving past them.

After close to a minute, I then saw a police van speeding from behind me on my rear view mir-



ror," he said.

Lukhele said he had no idea that the police van wanted him to stop so he kept on driving until he ended up bumping into a pavement, scratching his car bumper as he was trying to move out of the police van's way.

"I had no idea I was being stopped by the police, so I just kept on driving.

I thought the police van wanted me to move out of the way so I drove towards the side of the road thus allowing the police to pass but I got too close to the pavement thus bumping into it," he said.

Lukhele stated that when he stopped, the police then arrested him, much to his surprise.

Magistrate Mbatha disputed Lukhele's claim and said "it was obvious that the police were trying to stop you by driving behind you for at least two minutes."

Mbatha sentenced Lukhele to six months in a correctional facility if he failed to pay a fine of E600 for bumping into the pavement.

Sentenced

She further sentenced Lukhele to six months in a correctional facility if he failed to pay E600 for failing to stop when instructed to do so by police officer Ayanda Maseko.

Mbatha stated that Lukhele would have paid only E60 had he stopped when told to but now must fork out E1 200 unnecessari-



Applications for Extension of Time Submission of Income Tax Returns (Individuals and Companies)

In terms of Section 33(1) and (14) of the Income Tax Order of 1975, as Amended, the Commissioner General of the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) hereby advises all taxpayers that applications for extension of time are now open for submission to the SRA. These applications may be submitted by taxpayers who require more time to submit their Annual Income Tax Returns for the year of assessment ended 30 June 2016.

Manner of Application

Taxpayers are expected to do the following:

i. complete the extension of time application form in full,

ii. attach the necessary supporting documents as stated in the application form and

iii. submit such forms to the SRA on time.

Taxpayers are hereby informed that the time extended shall not exceed sixty (60) days. As such, the extended period for taxpayers whose financial year end is June 30, **shall not exceed 31 December 2016**. For taxpayers' that have been authorised by the Commissioner General, to use a substituted year of assessment, their extension may be for a period of up to sixty (60) days after the deadline for submission of their Income Tax Returns.

The following requirements must be fulfilled by the taxpayer when applying for extension of time:

i. Application for extension of time must be made and signed by the taxpayer's **public officer** only.

ii. All applications must be submitted 15 days before the end of the filing period as notified by the Commissioner General. i.e. 15 days before 31 October 2016 for taxpayers whose financial year end is 30 June 2016. For taxpayers that have been authorised, by the Commissioner General to use a substituted year of assessment, this will be 15 days before their respective filing deadline.

iii. Valid reasons causing the delay in furnishing the tax return must be advanced to the Commissioner General, supported by evidence thereof. iv. The taxpayer must be compliant in all tax types for a period of 3 years successively.

v. An interim return with estimated taxable income must be submitted together with interim financial statements/ trial balance attached.

vi. Income so declared in the Interim Return of Income should not be less than 90% of the actual taxable income submitted in the final return. Provided, however, where the estimated income is less than 90% sufficient reasons must be given for such shortfall.

N.B No applications will be processed after this deadline has elapsed.

REVISION OF ESTIMATED ASSESSMENTS TO THE ACTUAL RETURN ASSESSMENT

Taxpayers are hereby reminded that the interim returns and financials are not final but are in anticipation of actual filing on or before the expiration of the granted extension of time period.

For the final actual return to be considered for revision, the following conditions should be met:

i. Tax due resulting from the assessment of the interim tax returns should be paid in full notwithstanding the fact that the actual tax due is less than the estimate.

Failure to adhere to the above guidelines shall result in penalties being imposed in accordance with section 40 of the Order.

NB: THE SRA HEREBY REMINDS ALL TAXPAYERS THAT IT IS THEIR LEGAL OBLIGATION TO ENSURE THAT ALL THEIR TAX AFFAIRS ARE IN ORDER.

OVER 200 HAWKERS NOT HAPPY WITH MUNICIPALITY'S STANCE

CLOSE to 200 hawkers, popularly known as 'Dobha Phansi' doing business in Nhlangano, are bitter that the town Council has relocated them and further anticipates changing their market days.

A couple of weeks ago, the women operating 'Dobha Phansi' were removed next to the Nhlangano main bus rank to below KaMjuda Business Empire and they feel, the town council is not being fair to them

Other hawkers in Nhlangano feel 'Dobha Phansi' colleagues are giving them unfair competition, thus have approached the Council and suggested the trade be allocated Wednesdays and Thursdays to do business and should not operate on Fridays and Saturdays. It is alleged there was now factionalism within the hawking business in the town.



A couple of weeks ago, the women operating 'Dobha Phansi' were removed next to the Nhlangano main bus rank to below the KaMjuda Business Empire and they feel the Council is not being fair to them.

The empire has ample open space and the hawkers were allowed to do their business there after approaching the owner Rudolph 'Mjuda' Diamond, who is a popular businessman in Nhlangano and owns a number of properties. The Council has held meetings with both groups of hawkers with an aim of finding a lasting solution.

"We are comfortable operating our business here at KaMjuda and they can have their Fridays and Saturdays but we are still going to survive here as we have customers supporting us despite being far from town. The Council can remain with those who feel we are giving them unfair competition, as we are now operating on privately owned proper-

ty. We are even considering operating from Monday to the last day of the week and will see if this is not going to affect those who feel we are a threat to them," said one of the 'dobha phansi' members.

Meanwhile, Nhlangano Town Clerk Apollo Maphalala said he was not sure what has been finalised about the issue of 'Dobha Phansi'. He said what he was aware of is there was a time where the issue of days on when 'Dobha Phansi' hawkers would be allowed to operate.

"The two groups do not agree on days the 'Dobha Phansi' should be allowed to operate was being discussed. I am yet to know what was agreed on when they were called to thrash the issue out. As town council, we don't take sides but we want the hawkers to work in peace and harmony. On Wednesday, I might get a feedback from those tasked to work on the issue," said Maphalala.

THE year 2050, is three decades away, 34 years to be precisely and I can't wait to be there! (As if I will be there).





Should HIV testing be mandatory?



WHAT if every person in Swaziland were to take a test to determine whether he or she was HIV positive?

Would this make the infection rate for the disease go down?

Knowledge of one's HIV condition is useless unless a person who is HIV positive actually does something with the information, which would be to begin anti-retroviral treatment. Therefore, should mandatory testing be followed up by mandafory enrollment in ART?

Plaguing

These are questions asked by politicians throughout Africa they see an AIDS epidemic in its third decade with no end in sight. As leaders they wish to find a solution to the problem that is literally plaguing their people.

Mandatory testing is an understandable response to a difficult

There is no denying that if everyone knew their HIV status, then a country would know precisely how many people were HIV positive. Every HIV positive person would be able to obtain necessary life-prolonging Antiretroviral Therapy (ART). The

governments would be able to know exactly how to scale up their HIV response: The volume of drugs to secure, the number of personnel to employ, the number of clinics to build.

There is no question that universal testing for HIV would save millions of lives, billions of emalengeni and also significantly reduce the stress and suffering that societies experience due to HIV and AIDS.

That is one side of the argument, the one advocated at the SADC Summit.

The other side has to do with personal choice, and the moral obligation for society to recognise the right of every person to his or her pri-

Mandatory

In response to the proposal by some African governments to introduce mandatory HIV testing, the AIDS and Rights Alliance for Southern Africa (ARASA), a partnership of 73 southern and eastern African nongovernmental organi sations (NGOs), disagrees. The organisation feels mandatory HIV testing might reverse the gains made in the AIDS response over the past years. The position of the ARASA is that contrary to the belief promoted by some SADC heads of state, the truth is that mandatory HIV testing will not solve the HIV-AIDS problem in the region. Human rights issues aside (although these are important), ARASA noted that rather than push everyone to be tested and

making it a criminal offence if * they do not, "We should look critically at the underlying causes of the low levels of HIV testing and uptake the prevention and other HIV-related services."

The umbrella organisation of health NGOs also noted that the sudden reverse course on mandatory testing would go against years of African countries' committed to the full realisation of human rights and fundamental freedoms as crucial to stopping AIDS, including eliminating discrimination against people with HIV and key populations at higher risk of HIV.

Discrimination

"Unacceptably high levels of HIV-related stigma and discrimination and human rights violations at the hands of families, communities, law enforcement officials, health care providers and employers as well as legal and policy frameworks that fail to protect people living with HIV, women and key populations at higher risk of HIV continue to present insurmountable barriers to HIV prevention efforts," the organisa-

tion believes. If such discrimination were to end, many more people would

test for HIV.

There would be no need to force people to test. They would do so on their own, voluntarily.

In other words, the best way to ensure that everyone gets tested for HIV is if the social stigma against HIV were eliminated. No one would have to be forced to be tested because they would not fear being ostracised by their family, friends, churches, coworkers and governments.

"Fears of mandatory testing and breaches of confidentiality drive individuals at higher risk of HIV away from testing services. Neither will mandatory testing ensure that people who need it can access life-saving anti-retroviral treatment," noted ARASA.

Evidence over the last 30 years has shown that successful HIV prevention interventions depend on an environment of safety in which people at risk of HIV can demand and seek services without fear of stigma, discrimination and abuse of their human rights, ARASA said.

Progress

Some progress has indeed been made using the voluntary testing model. A 2013 report from UNAIDS on the status of HIV response in eastern and southern Africa reports that there has been a 30% reduction in new infections between 2001 and 2011 as well as 50% reduction in new child infections between 2001 and 2011 in the region.

Health groups point to this data as evidence that current policy is working, albeit not at the pace that would cheer some countries' leaderships.

By going with what has proved to have worked and make it work better - namely reducing stigma associated with HIV and discrimination against HIV-positive people, more people will be less afraid to know their HIV status. More people will get treatment, and more people will live. This would lessen personal stress and larger stress on society, and have beneficial economic consequences for every SADC nation.

OLD POSTURES, NEW TIMES: WE NEED TO FAIL BETTER

WE cannot pretend the unpalatable scenes playing out across university campuses are surprising.

They are shocking. They are terrible. They ought to fill us with fear, of what is happening, but also, about what is being done in the name of 'democracy'. Forty years after the events of June 1976, thirty years after the painful ugliness of Botha's states of emergency, once again stones are flung, and young bodies are in flight from police fire.

Condemnatory gestures do not address the problems, and go no way towards resolving them. Criminalising young people and their conduct which is so unacceptable to so many of us, will get us no further towards resolving the political problems at the heart of these events. Of course we cannot afford, in the current economic-political system, to 'lose' an academic year. It takes little imagination to work through the consequences of a suspended academic year, but it may be important to remind us of what these would be.

Accommodating

The already under-resourced post-secondary would have trouble accommodating new students into already swollen first-year classes. Accommodation and the resources needed to run them would have to be expanded, and the time frame makes this inconceivable. Poor students and their families would have to make additional sacrifices, despite the cash injections from government into the national loan scheme.

But we also cannot risk reducing the crisis in post-school education and training to an economic problem. It is at heart a political problem. It is the latest symptom of an older, untreated malaise, one we have for too long left untreated. Also, we cannot continue to imagine dealing with the surface manifestations of the underlying disease in the body politic will somehow resolve the problem. And so many of the current responses engage only the surface not the substance of the political trouble we find ourselves in.

Violence on campuses are of course to be deplored. But beyond the distress such violence induces, we need to ask ourselves what its causes are, and how we address those causes. Students have not changed at the level of DNA in the half-century since the first state interventions in university independence in South Africa. The scenes across our campuses are familiar to those who lived through the 1980s. The responses are equally familiar. Have we learned nothing from our own intimate

histories of violence and violation?

The violent actions of some in the student insurgency have been condemned, and rightly so. The violent actions of some in the security and police agencies have been condemned, and rightly so. But these two sets of actors are not in the same order of responsibility, nor do they derive the same kind of political or economic authority. We may all supposedly be equal in this post-millennial post-apartheid democracy, but what is theoretically true may not be substantially real.

Sanction

The South African Police Service is a state agency: they operate in the name of, on behalf of, and with the powerful sanction of the government that runs that state on behalf of the people who live in that state, and brought that government to power. Security companies are paid large sums of money to deliver the men and women who do the dangerous work at the lowest ends of the spectrum of remuneration in. Students are individuals and groups who are barely adults.

We must hold all of these individuals and groups to account, but it is disingenuous to pretend they have equal access to power, resources, or legitimacy, whether in material terms or in access to how they are represented

However, in 2016, the ways in which information about the protests and the responses to them can be distributed has left many of the most powerful actors at a disadvantage.

The state is no longer the only distributor of images and film footage telling the story of what happened. The gap between events and wide distribution of film and images of these is almost non-existent. Across social media platforms, and via the networks of people connected through smart mobile technology, the ability to cover (in its double meaning) events with

official versions is slipping away from the most powerful sectors in this most unequal society.

2016 is not 1976. The ability to control what people make of events was never fully real. Many of us who lived in apartheid South Africa, or survived it, know we did not believe the sanctioned, authorised versions of our lives circulating in public. We cultivated habits of critical literacy, taught ourselves to read the world we lived in and the representations of that world circulated by the powerful, against the grain. It meant the denunciations and vilification of those who fought state oppression had quite the opposite effect for most of us.

Devalued

At base, the very ways in which Blackness and poverty were devalued required of some of us to insist that the images of ourselves circulated by power were inaccurate.

It is interesting to note how the old postures against student protests in 2016 echo the responses by those accommodated to and protective of the status quo of the 1980s. When asked about this echo, the response is too often that while that was a fascist state, this is a democracy. As if that word 'democracy' is the shibboleth that covers even the unpalatable, and worse, the unacceptable.

We cannot just adopt old postures for new times. The political troubles we face today need us to respond differently from how we had in the past. After all, those past responses are part of the record of failures to address the problems which brought us to this point. This goes for everyone invested in this current political moment, whether the student protestors, who are the focus of so much of the censure, or the police.

But the civil authorities and managers must also take responsibility for getting us to this point.

Clearly the solutions proposed and implemented, whether by

university managers, have not worked. We cannot indulge in the madness of returning to a time where we think militarised responses to political conflicts resolve them, or defuse them. 2016 should not look like 1986, or 1976. We owe it to our children, who are in these spaces where the conflicts unfold, to do better. Watching groups of young bodies fleeing before adults firing guns is less distressing than having been one of those bodies. But it now happens in a 'democracy' signals to me the political failure to change the society more fundamentally. And failure is one the generation I belong to must own. And precisely because some among us know what it is like to run from militarised police actions against our political work, and we have the bodily scars to remind us of the cost.

We cannot return to another state of emergency. We must address the status quo with urgency, but it is not enough to reduce this current crisis as one of law and its administration.

Absurd

That would be to deal with symptoms, not causes. Also, it would be absurd to want to resolve this current crisis between identified 'leaders' only. The conflicts need to be de-escalated as a matter of urgency. But those who brought us to this impasse must take responsibility: the adults who made the country we now live in, those of us who were complicit with that making, and those merely implicated by our quiescence, and more than most, the political actors who have failed to address the troubles underpinning this crisis. We are all responsible; we must all work together to fix this, or we will all risk the consequences of failure.

We made this world and its procedures. We must unmake it. We need new solutions to our problems. We cannot just assume old postures in new times.

The political price of the latter is too high. Asking for individual 'leaders' to solve what is essentially a political crisis constitutes a fundamental category error in analysis.

We must hold to account the authorities who brought us to this impasse; and we must work together to work out new solutions, together, in an atmosphere of mutual trust and respect. Reaching for guns and firing them at our children will only serve to brutalise another generation of South Africans.

GRIGUTURE MINISTR CAPITAL PROJECTS HIT A SNA

UNAVAILABILITY of funds has delayed the implementation of the ministry of agriculture capital projects.

According to the ministry's first quarter performance report 2016/17, funds were allocated to implement nine capital projects by the ministry with a total budget allocation of over E532 million for the 2016/17 financial

"As at June 2016, the ministry has prepared and submitted requisitions requesting release of funds amounting to E52 217 000, but the funds were yet to be released and availed for disbursement under the projects," said the report.

The funds were requested both from government and external financiers.

Although Principal Secretary

Bongani Masuku said there have been new developments, "although money is not flowing the way we would have preferred it to be, but we have received some of the funds for the imple-

mentation of the capital projects." He said the funds have been already disbursed to the projects for implementation.

"However, it is true this has slowed down the implementation of capital projects, but we have begun implementation of these," he said.

These projects included the Komati Basin Project-Downstream Development, Lower Usuthu-Downstream

Development, purchase of heavy plant and earth dam construction material, water and irrigation development at Sigangeni, Mpuluzi and Gege, Food Security Project, Smallholder Market Led Production Project, Lower Usuthu II Extension-Downstream Development, Innovative Beef Value Chain Schemes and Renovation and expansion of Mpisi breeding station.

In the report, the ministry said it was in the process of implementing a number of programmes aimed to enhance food security in the country through increased production and promotion of import substitution

Rainfall

After receiving below normal cumulative rainfall during the 2015/16 rainfall season, the country has experienced a significant drop in the overall production, especially of maize.

Production was projected to be 33 460 metric tonnes compared to 81 623 metric tonnes in 2014/15.

The report said the planned imports of maize included a commercial import of 39 000 metric tonnes and food aid imports of 100 000 metric tonnes.

The ministry also seeks to promote commercialisation and diversification of crops and livestock production in the country.

Recently, Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati said the ministry was in the process of establishing the Swaziland National Agricultural Research Authority (SNARA).

He said the idea has already been approved by cabinet and now awaits endorsement by parliament.

Vilakati said this has the potential to create jobs and improve productivity of agriculture thus aid in food security.

"For example, R&D allows the agricultural sector to increase value addition. Value addition is one of the initiatives the ministry has identified that can greatly aid the economy in general and the agricultural sector in particular systems for agriculture island countries, namely, Burundi, the Comoros, Guinea, Lesotho, Swaziland, and Zimbabwe," he

IMMINENT SA VAT INCREASE, A SQUEEZE FOR SWAZILAND

THE possible increase of Value Added Tax (VAT) by South Africa could have a negative impact on the Swazi economy.

Any tax increment normally erodes consumers' disposable income, otherwise known as purchasing power.

University of Swaziland (UNISWA) lecturer and economist Sandile Khumalo, said the proposed increase in VAT by South Africa would have both positive and negative enects on our economy.

"For easy administration purposes, the country will have no other option but to follow suit due to the fact that our economy is mostly dependent on the South African economy for both imports and exports," he said.

Khumalo further said if, for instance, South Africa was to increase its VAT rate to 16 percent and Swaziland maintains its 14 percent, this would mean SRA would have to facilitate the payment of the difference two



percent for items bought from VAT registered taxpayers in the Republic thus creating an extra administrative burden to the tax authority.

"VAT is simple to administer as compared to other indirect taxes. It is clear that from a purely macro-economic standpoint, an increase in VAT is less distortionary than an

increase in direct taxes," he said. Khumalo said if Swaziland was to follow suit, an increase in the VAT rate would be a more efficient way of boosting revenue than increasing direct taxes as most countries make more money through VAT.

"However, taking such a move would also hurt the poor as this will push up commodity prices (inflation).

This might also increase the costs of setting up businesses-by increasing investment capital, inputs though VAT refunds will help ease the pressure," he said.

Continental publication Africa Time, said local economist Dumisani Sithole, said the fact that Swaziland imports about 80 percent of goods and services from South Africa means a VAT hike by the neighbouring country could lead to price increase on most goods and services.

"Importers might be forced to buy the goods and services at high prices and they may be forced to pass that to consumers," Africa Time said.

The publication reported that short and long-term challenges could result from the tax increase, saying some importers might be forced out of business.

However, on a positive note, Sithole said Swaziland could also explore opportunities in alternative markets where it could source goods and services other than relying on South Africa.

ELECTRICITY PRICING SHOULD BE MORE EQUITABLE - SERA

THE current system of pricing electricity is not equitable, as those who can afford are paying the same as those struggling to pay for electricity.

Swaziland Energy Regulatory Agency (SERA) Chief Executive Officer Vusumuzi Mkhumane said the pricing of electricity was very important, therefore, he said the country should place it as a priority factor for development.

"It is important to know that currently, electricity consumed in households is already subsidised, even though people complain that the rates are high," he said.

Mkhumane made these remarks yesterday during the regulator's stakeholders meeting held at the Institute of Development Management premises in Matsapha.

He said the main objective of the meeting was for stakeholders to give their input into the tariff structure of the country, after which the proposal would be sent to cabinet for their consideration and subsequent approval.

Mkhumane said another issue that SERA as a regulator was looking into, was to ensure that energy providers in the country were sustained by the pricing method used.

"We are concerned with looking at that while energy providers look to make a profit, we as a regulator need to ensure their pricing mechanism is fair to the citizens of the country," he said.

The CEO said it was yet unknown when and if the proposed scheme was likely to be implemented as there were still various steps that needed to be

taken first.

"The electricity subsidy will be concerned with looking at who should be receiving a subsidy and who should not because they have an ability to pay. The other benefit of setting up the new electricity tariff is that it will be able to promote efficient usage of electricity," he said.

SERA announced earlier this year it had come up with a proposal that would introduce a subsidy into the pricing of electricity in the country. Mkhumane said they wanted electricity to be affordable for all Swazis, "thus we obtained consultants to look into the feasibility of a subsidy for electricity in this country."

Mkhumane expressed the regulator's aspiration to enable the less fortunate to be able to have electricity and move on to first world status. "Electricity is expensive for some, however, these individuals also need the electricity to be able to do a lot of other things like ironing and storing food in a fridge," he said.

IMF PROJECTS INFLATION TO DROP

THE International Monetary Fund (IMF) expects inflation in the country to drop in the current year and average around 5.5 percent.

"Inflation in Swaziland is set to average 5.5 percent for the current financial year. In 2017 the year-on—year inflation rate of the country is projected to be 6.6 percent," the IMF said.

Currently, inflation in the country stands at eight percent and was still below the 5.5 percent projected by the IMF.

The IMF's World Economic Outlook
Report 2016 economic analysis of the
country came to the conclusion that not
only economic growth would be slow,
but the country in the next couple of years
would run a trade deficit after enjoying
many years of trade surplus.

Balance

"The balance on current account in 2016 will contract by 4.9 percent as opposed to the 9.2 percent recorded the precious financial year. Projections indicate that the balance of current account will contract 2.4 percent in 2017," reads the report in part.

The bank said the balance on current account would reach positive territory around 2021 where projections were that the balance of payments would be 0.6 percent.

The Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) annual report 2015/2016 said the impressive growth of the current account surplus recorded in 2015 was mainly as a result of the widening trade surplus combined with a net inflow in current transfers during the year.

SACU STATES GRAPPLING WITH HIGH FOOD PRICES

SOUTHERN African Customs
Union (SACU) member states
have continued to register double
figure inflation in food and nonalcoholic beverages as the region
continues to take a beating from
the ongoing drought.

According to the SACU August inflation report, only Botswana recorded a single digit in food and non-alcoholic beverages.

The report notes that during the month of August 2016, when compared to July 2016, inflation rates eased in all member states with the exception of Swaziland where prices increased.

"The change in consumer prices in August 2016 was high in Swaziland, recording a change of 8.0 percent followed by Namibia at 6.8 percent, Lesotho at 6.6 percent, South Africa at 5.9 percent, and Botswana at 2.6 percent," said the report.

However, all member states continued to record a single digit annual inflation rate.

The report said monetary stance was unaltered between July and August 2016 in all member states with exception of Botswana again, where the bank rate was reduced by half a percentage point.

During the month of August, the highest prime lending rate was observed in Lesotho at 11.69 percent, followed by Namibia at 10.75 percent, South Africa, 10.50 per-

cent, Swaziland, 10.50 percent and Botswana, 7.00 percent.

In the recent monetary policy statement, the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) Governor Majozi Sithole said the bank considered the increase in inflation as temporary.

"Salary increments above average inflation contributed significantly to the inflation outcomes. Further, food inflation also contributed to the inflation increase by coming in at 17.4 percent in August 2016,

about two percent higher than observed in July," said the governor.

He said the supportive policies for the importation of food items would help alleviate pressure from food price inflation in the near term.

The country's inflation projections for the rest of 2016 were improved by 0.4 percent from an average annual rate of 7.7 percent to 7.3 percent in the September 2016 forecast.


SAA SETS A COLLISION COURSE WITH PILOTS

JOHANNESBURG - South African Airways (SAA), the financially hamstrung national carrier, is forging ahead with plans to rationalise flight deck crew costs, which might land it in a court fight with its about 800 pilots.

The company says there is a need to interrogate and amend the regulating agreement with the crew.

Amending the agreement, however, requires buy-in from the South African Airways Pilots Association (Saapa). The association has previously indicated it will oppose proposed changes to existing agreements. In a recent SAA internal document, seen by Business Day, the airline discusses the effect of the flight deck crew regulating agreement and the strategy to address the "onerous" collective agreements with crew.

SAA says certain sections of the regulating agreement are not in the

spirit of the Public Finance
Management Act, which states a public entity must maintain a procurement system that is cost-effective and must take effective steps to manage working capital efficiently.

SAA spokesman Tlali Tlali confirmed "there is a process of engagement currently under way between SAA and Saapa, which relates to the existing recognition agreement between the airline and its pilots. We are not at liberty to share details on progress of the process until all engagements have been concluded". *iNet Bridge*

INVESTEC UNIT PARTNERS WITH ABACUS IN OFFICE DEAL

PRETORIA - Investec
Australia Property Fund
(IAPF), the JSE-listed
Australian domiciled fund, has
acquired a 50 percent interest
in an institutional grade office
tower in the central business
district of Brisbane with
Abacus Property Group for
A\$132 million (R1.4 billion).

The transaction will increase the value of IAPF's property portfolio to A\$583m.

Forward yield

IAPF said On Monday the property comprised a two-storey basement car park with 98 secure parking spaces, ground-level retail, a three-level podium and main tower of 22Âlevels with average floor plates of 739 square metres.

Tenants include Allianz, ANZ, Brookfield Multiplex, North Queensland Bulk Ports, Asciano, American Express and Link Market Services. IAPF said the property would be acquired on a 12-month forward yield of 7.2 percent with annual contractual

rental escalations of 3.9 percent. But it said it had been acquired with 20 percent vacancy, which equated to about 4 000m2, and there was an opportunity to substantially increase the yield of the property to 8.9 percent on a fully leased basis through strategic capital works and an active leasing campaign.

Strategy

Graeme Katz, the Chief Executive of IAPF, said the acquisition aligned well with the fund's strategy and was its third acquisition where it had adopted a strategy to take on existing vacancy, which had proven successful before.

"We believe the price a square metre of A\$6 642 represents attractive value given that recent transactions [in] proximity had been concluded at between A\$7 700 and A\$9 700 a square metre." The acquisition will be funded through the fund's existing debt facility. IAPF shares gained 0.97 percent Monday to R14.63. *IOL*

OIL HOLDS GAINS NEAR 15 MONTH HIGH ON SAUDI

MOSCOW - Oil held gains near the highest settlement in almost 15 months as Russia and Saudi Arabia said they're ready to cooperate to limit output.

The International Energy Agency said the market may rebalance faster than expected if OPEC sticks to its new target.

Futures were little changed in New York after climbing 3.1 percent Monday. Russia is willing to join OPEC efforts to stabilize the market, requiring either a production freeze or cut, according to President Vladimir Putin. Saudi Energy Minister Khalid Al-Falih said other countries are ready to cooperate and he's optimistic there will be a deal. Supply and demand could come back into balance earlier than expected next year if OPEC's agreement to curb output is implemented, the International Energy Agency said. Oil has gained almost 15 percent since OPEC provisionally agreed last month to cut production for the first time in eight years. The group's members will meet this week in Istanbul for talks on implementing the deal and Al-Falih said it's not unthinkable prices will rise to \$60 a barrel by the end of this year. Bloomberg

Shares started on the New York Stock

Exchange at the opening of business in New York on Tuesday.

"As a truly global brewer, we will be able to achieve more together than each of us could separately," said AB InBev CEO Carlos Brito on Tuesday.

"We remain focused on delivering superior top-line growth and increasing shareholder value. Building on our strong heritage, passion for brewing and expanded brand portfolio, we are also committed to helping farmers, retailers, entrepreneurs and communities thrive. "We are excited to work toward our dream: Bringing people together for a better world. Our ambition is to build a company to last - not just for a decade, but for the next 100 years." Building on our shared commitment to sustainability, the combined group will strive to be an engine for growth and economic development across our markets, the company said. Fin24



Northam in R1bn rights deal

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's Northam Platinum has acquired a mining right from Anglo American Platinum (Amplats) for R1 billion (\$72 million), the companies said yesterday.

"The proceeds will be used to further reduce net debt and strengthen Anglo American Platinum's balance sheet," Amplats CEO Chris Griffith said. The right comprises around 16.7 million ounces and is on the northwestern boundary of Northam's Zondereinde mine. Northam says it will be able to extract higher-grade ore for longer. The resource is similar in character to that of the Zondereinde ore body.

"A short lead time and limited capital expenditure are required to access the acquired resource from Zondereinde's existing infrastructure," Northam says.

The transaction remains subject to the consent of the minister of mineral resources.

New chapter for nuclear firm

CAPE TOWN – South Africa's state-owned nuclear company NECSA has received R1.7m as part of a fabrication contract to manufacture nuclear reactor components for Russia, it said yesterday.

The South African Nuclear Energy Corporation (NECSA) said in a statement the first items fabricated at Pelindaba were delivered to Russian company Tenex, a subsidiary of Rosatom. The first payment represents about a quarter to a third of the total contract, it said.

The announcement comes as the lid of controversy seems to be lifting on NECSA.

This follows Energy Minister Tina Joemat-Pettersson's implementation of a task team to investigate its board and executive (with no clear outcome), while NECSA had delayed the tabling of its annual financial reports over the auditor general's concerns over decommissioning and decontamination costs. CEO Phumzile Tshelane was also put on suspended suspension last year.

However, the announcement of a new board this year and the tabling at the end of September of its report has opened a new chapter at NECSA. The resolution saw government taking partial responsibility for exorbitant costs, which NECSA believes is

R40bn for new coal power projects

JOHANNESBURG - The pepartment of Energy on Monday unveiled coal independent power producers (IPPs) Khanyisa and Thabametsi as the preferred bidders to build two coal-fired power plants that will add 863.3 megawatts (MW) of electricity to the country's system in the next five years.

Khanyisa and Thabametsi are part of the department's coal base load IPP procurement programme.

The programme, which will be in two bid windows, allows private firms to produce electricity from coal, an area dominated by Eskom.

It is similar to the renewable energy independent power producer procurement (REIPPP) programme, which has resulted in the procurement of a total of 6 376 MW in six bid windows.

Of the 6 376MW, 2 200MW has been connected to the grid.



The department said more than R40.1 billion of debt and equity had been committed to the mooted coal projects in Mpumalanga and Limpopo.

The first plant under the programme would begin commercial operation in December 2020, it said.

Minister of Energy, Tina Joemat-Pettersson, said the bidders had the backing of Korean, Japanese and Saudi Arabian investors.

Marubeni Corporation of Japan is the lead developer of the Thabametsi IPP, while Korea Electric Power Corporation (Kepco) is its co-developer.

Funding. The Development Bank of Southern Africa, the Industrial Development Corporation and the Public Investment Corporation will also provide funding, according to the department. Exxaro's Greenfield Thabametsi mine will supply coal for the IPP project.

In the bid process, the Department of Energy required the bidders to have a minimum South African participation of 51 percent, 30 percent black ownership and a weighted broad-based black economic empowerment contributor status level of five for locally based shareholders.

It said the two projects would create 6 613 jobs during construction and 13 524 jobs during operation. Thabametsi is scheduled to commence operations in March 2021, while Khanyisa's scheduled commercial operations date is December 2019.

The department has stipulated the risks that the private sector players will shoulder. These include risks of capital cost, operating costs overruns and costs associated with delays during construction. *Fin24*

Bamako shuts Randgold office over R3bn tax dispute

LONDON - Randgold Resources said on Monday the government of Mali had closed its offices in the capital, Bamako, over a \$230-million (R3.1-billion) tax claim the South African gold producer is contesting.

In a statement, Randgold Resources said it was disappointed at Bamako's move but insisted "the closure does not affect the operations of its three mines in Mali".

The London- and New York-quoted firm added it had been professionally advised "that a large proportion of the tax claims received from the state of Mali in respect of its operations in that country are without merit or foundation".

"Following the appropriate legal process, it is strongly defending its position in relation to these claims."

Randgold also noted that the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes had recently awarded \$29.2-million plus costs to its Loulo operation for taxes which the centre found the Malian government had wrongly collected.

"We have continued to engage with the Malian authorities at the highest level to resolve the remaining issues," Randgold Resources Chief Executive Mark Bristow said in urging a constructive approach to bring about a "mutually acceptable solution."

Mali is of strategic importance for the group, which also has a gold mine in Ivory Coast and the Democratic Republic of Congo and which last year posted net profits of \$189-million on sales of \$1.4-billion. Last year, Bristow hailed the mine at Loulo and neighbouring site of Gounkoto as being of major benefit to the Malian economy, indicating the complex had contributed some \$700-million "in taxes, royalties and dividends" to the state, while injecting "an additional \$1.9-billion into the economy" through supplier and contractor payments and employee wages. *AFP*

VWSA installs robots to rev up production

PRETORIA - Volkswagen South Africa (VWSA) has installed 320 new robots in the body shop at its vehicle manufacturing plant in Uitenhage as part of the R3 billion investment in its production facilities for the production of at least two new vehicle models.

Thomas Schaefer, the Chairman and Managing Director of VWSA, said on Monday that the robots would perform monotonous, high-precision work and allowed body shop employees to focus on tasks that required human involvement. ' introduction of robots will improve the ergonomics in the body shop as it reduces strain on our people. The introduction of the specialised robots into the body shop paves the way for higher volumes and even better quality," he said. Schaefer said the technology being installed would enable VWSA to produce more than one model on one single assembly line. The carmaker said last year it would be investing R4.5 billion into South Africa by next year, with the R3 billion to be invested in its production facilities also raising annual production capacity of its plant by 50 percent to 150 000 units. A further R1.5 billion is to be invested in the development of local supplier capacity and R29 million on the development of employees. Business Report





Wimpy owner sees earnings surge

CAPE TOWN - Famous Brands said yesterday that it expected an increase of between 67 percent and 74 percent in headline earnings per share for the six months to the end of August.

The company said headline earnings per share were expected to come in at 403-419 cents per share, up from 241 cents per share in the corresponding period a year before.

Famous Brands, which owns restaurant brands including Wimpy, Mugg & Bean and Steers, noted that the results had been impacted by two exceptional items, a R141 million gain and a R20 million impairment. The positive R141



million was a derivative gain on a call option used to hedge the purchase price of the acquisition of Gourmet Burger Kitchen in the UK, and the comparatively small hit was an impairment of the investment made in 2013 in UAC Restaurants in Nigeria.

CASH SHORTAGES WORSEN AS ZIM AWAITS BOND NOTES

HARARE - Cash shortages in Zimbabwe are worsening as the introduction of bond notes - set for November - to stem the problem becomes imminent.

Some banks have reduced monthly withdrawal limits for individuals from \$100 (R1 381) a day to between \$20 and \$50, while companies are now allowed daily withdrawals of up to \$500, down from \$1 000.

ZB Bank, in which the government has a controlling stake, appears to be among the hardest hit, with branch managers' first task in the morning being to tell anxious clients whether or not there is cash for withdrawals.

Mobile money banking has not been spared either, with recipients who had become used to getting instant cash now having to hop from one agent to another looking for money. With some banks giving out very little, some people are now opting for retail shops which can give up to \$100 as cash-back for plastic money purchases of \$15 and above.

Despite assurances that their US dollar values will be maintained, many Zimbabweans have remained sceptical over the impending introduction of bond notes, to be effected in small doses of small denominations of \$2 and \$5 equivalents. The notes will be supported by a \$200 million facility from the Africa Export and Import Bank (Afreximbank). An initial \$75 million worth of bond notes will be injected into the market by the end of the year. Vice President Emmerson Mnangagwa said last week the government was crafting a law that would support the introduction of the bond notes and Zimbabweans should prepare themselves for

their coming.

"It is going to be reality. We are going to live with it. Those who can easily realise that reality should begin to accept that bond notes will be with us," he said when he hosted a lunch following the opening of the 4th session of the 8th Parliament by President Robert Mugabe.

However, opposition parties and other interest groups are reportedly waiting for the promulgation of the law so they can challenge its constitutionality.

Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe Governor John Mangudya said this week that the release of the notes had been moved to early November from the earlier planned end of October to allow their marketing.

He told the weekly private run newspaper, the Financial Gazette, that while, there was public scepticism over the notes, they would help maintain the current multi-currency system rather than eliminate it.

Internet will drive media revenue

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's entertainment and media sector is expected to grow from R126 billion last year to R173 billion by 2020, with the internet set to be the key driver, according to a PwC report.

The local internet access market is set to rise from R39.4 billion last year to R68.5 billion in 2020, as fixed and mobile broadband become essential utilities.

The PwC report predicts growth will be seen in the video game market, filmed entertainment and television segments.

PwC Southern Africa entertainment and media industry leader Vicki Myburgh said: "As internet revenues continue to rise, the forecast for newspaper and magazine circulation is on the decline as consumers migrate from print to free online alternatives, and aren't as yet moving to paid digital formats in great numbers."

Something that is concerning for publishers is that digital advertising is under added threat because of competition from Facebook and Google.

Smartphone connections in South Africa are forecast to grow by about 160% from 24.8 million last year to 64.6 million in 2020, leading to a penetration rate of 60% that will fuel mobile internet access revenue growth. Totally, online advertising spend grew 23.6% last year to reach R3.8 billion. By 2020, this figure will rise to R8.2 billion. South Africa has the largest TV market in Africa and continues to grow strongly with pay TV subscription revenues expected to expand to reach R25.2 billion in 2020. Fin 24

I gave Zuma all evidence implicating him - Madonsela

JOHANNESBURG - It is in the interest of President Jacob Zuma to account for what he knows regarding the allegations of state capture which had been forwarded to him in March, the public protector says.

Thuli Madonsela was reacting to a statement from the Presidency, issued on Monday.

It relates to the public protector's investigation into the alleged involvement of the Gupta family in the dismissal and appointment of cabinet ministers and members of the boards of directors of state-owned enterprises.

The Presidency said Zuma had written to the public protector requesting her to allow him to question other witnesses, who have appeared before the public protector.

"Furthermore, the president would want to exercise his right to question some of the witnesses before responding to the written questions and adducing evidence," the presidency said.

"The public protector would like to report that President Jacob Zuma was afforded a proper opportunity to tender his evidence since 22 March 2016.

"President Zuma was on Saturday, October 1, 2016, given all copies of evidence implicating him," the public protector said in a statement issued on Monday night.

She said his lawyer raised a request to question witnesses for the first time last Thursday, when he was asking for a deferment of the investigation to the next public protector.

She said the Executive Members' Ethics Act required an investigation regarding possible violations of the Executive Ethics Code to be concluded within 30 days.

"It is of concern to the public protector that the president has on two occasions undertaken to answer questions and when the time arose, he changed his mind."

She appealed to Zuma to assist with any information he has that can assist the investigation, primarily, by answering the questions put to him.

Madonsela's term as Public Protector ends on Friday.

Religious leaders gather for report into rogue pastors

BRAAMFONTEIN - Religious leaders gathered in Braamfontein yesterday morning for the release of a report into the commercialisation of religions and abuse of people's belief systems.

The report was to be released by the Commission for Promotions and Protection of the Rights of Religious, Cultural and Linguistic Communities, following months of intense grilling of church leaders, including the Zion Christian Church's Bishop Barnabas Lekganyane, Pastor Ray McCauley of Rhema Bible Church and Grace Bible Church's Bishop Mosa Sono.

The Advertising Standards Authority, Broadcasting Complaints Commission of SA, the departments of home affairs and social development, among others, also appeared before the commission.

In August 2015, the CRL Rights
Commission undertook an investigative
study into the commercialisation of religion
and the abuse of peoples' belief systems following an exposé of a Pretoria church where
people were fed snakes. Among the church
leaders who appeared before the commission was the 'snake pastor', Penuel Mnguni,
who also fed his followers hair, cloths, rats,
ants and carpet.

His close friend, Pastor Lesego Daniels, who is known for feeding people grass, leaves and petrol, also appeared. The pair told the commission they were instructed by God to feed people all these things, and added that no one had died.

Mazibuko can still play a major role in SA politics - Zille

CAPE TOWN - Speaking at the Cape Town press club during the launch of her autobiography titled 'Not Without a Fight,' Zille said Mazibuko — who controversially left her position in the party in 2014 and is currently a resident fellow of the Harvard Institute of Politics in the US — can still play a key role within the DA going forward.

"Yes (she can still play a role)...Lindiwe is one of the most talented, able and articulate brains in South Africa," Zille said.

In her book, Zille discusses at length her decision to back Mazibuko for the parliamentary leadership position against the incumbent at the time, Athol Trollip. Zille says she was wrong to throw her weight behind Mazibuko at the time. She suggested that, Mazibuko — who was 31

when she won the parliamentary leadership race in 2011 — might have been too young and inexperienced for the position.

Zille states in her book that the race for the parliamentary leader-ship position was "divisive" from the outset and there was "blood on the floor before a single vote had been cast".

Zille suggests in the book that as soon as Mazibuke took ever as leader of the DA in parliament, two centres of power were created. Mazibuke erected a 'Berlin Wall' between the office of party leader and that of the leader in parliament. Among other changes, Mazibuko cancelled the practice of joint press conferences by the party and parliamentary leaders, and refused to share an office with Zille in parliament.



Zim's street vendors turn on style to win customers

HARARE - In his threepiece suit, matching hat and bow tie, Farai Mushayademo could easily pass for a celebrity musician — if only his job didn't involve dodging cars at a busy intersection in Zimbabwe's capital, Harare, selling bottled water and potato chips to passing motorists.

Mushayademo's distinctive dress sense, with a different shiny suit every day, makes him a darling to customers and helps him beat the "rising competition," he said.

Massive joblessness in this once-prosperous southern African country has forced many to flood the streets, where they hawk anything from medicines to car parts. A good gimmick can help a ven-

dor stand out from the crowd. While such scenes are com-

mon throughout Africa, they are unusual in Zimbabwe, where vendors once were found only at legally designated stalls. Now, as the economy plunges, such order is breaking down.

Sidewalks in Harare and other cities and towns are hardly passable for pedestrians due to the high volume of vendors. Some plunge into the streets to target motorists.

"The suits are part of my marketing strategy," Mushayademo told The Associated Press.

"Vendors are associated with shabbiness, but people want to buy food from someone who is smartly dressed," said the 35-year-old father of three, a tailor by profession. Tailors have been hit hard because of an influx of secondhand clothes smuggled from neighbouring Mozambique that sell for as little as \$1.

Zimbabwe's official unemployment rate is 11%, according to the country's statistics agency, Zimstat, but the figure excludes informal traders such as street hawkers who are officially defined as employed because they earn an income. That sector is booming, with over 90 percent of the people officially defined as employed involved in informal trade, according to Zimstat figures.

This country's longtime leader, President Robert Mugabe, had promised to create 2.2 million jobs in five years during his 2013 election campaign. That hasn't happened. AFP

Judges out on bail after weekend arrents

ABUJA - The Nigerian judges arrested at the weekend as part of a corruption probe have been released on bail, a source said on Monday, after the detention drew sharp rebuke from legal and rights

"They were all released on bail Sunday on self-recognition," the source within the Department of State Services (DSS) told AFP. "They did report for investigation Monday and they have gone back home. And the investigation continues..." the source added. "Everything went very procedurally well and civil." At least seven judges were arrested at the weekend on allegations of receiving bribes, leading to an outcry from the bar association and rights groups who described the raids as "unprecedented". The investigation involves a total of 15 judges. DSS said it had seized \$800 000 in cash during the nation-wide operation which was prompted by allegations of corruption and professional misconduct made by other judges. On Monday, Chief Justice Mahmud Mohammed condemned the arrests as "deeply regrettable." The DSS said the arrests followed "lack of co-operation by the National Judicial Council, such as refusal by the NJC to allow the affected persons to be questioned by the DSS." AFP

Rwanda angered by French reopening juvenal killing investigation

KIGALI - Rwandan President Paul Kagame criticised France on Monday after French investigators reopened an investigation into the 1994 assassination of the Rwandan president, a killing that triggered the country's genocide.

"The judicial system of Rwanda is not subordinate to France or France's interests," Kagame told a cheering audience of judges, senior military officers and government officials at an official judicial function.

"It should be France in the dock being tried, not anybody in Rwanda and not Rwandans."

Rwanda's former chief of army staff Faustin Kayumba Nyamwasa, now in exile, has accused Kagame of being linked to the shooting down of the plane carrying president Habyarimana Juvenal, the president of Burundi and a French air crew. Nyamwasa made the accusations against Kagame in a widely reported trial in 2012, two years after an attempt to murder Nyamwasa in South Africa. Kagame says the plane was shot down by Juvenal's own supporters who disapproved of a peace deal Juvenal had negotiated with Kagame's rebels.



Before the genocide, France was Rwanda's main Western backer. But their relations collapsed after the genocide as Kagame accused France of training and arming the Hutu militias who were the main force behind the slaughter - an accusation Paris always denied. *Reuters*

Burundi bans three UN human rights investigators

KIGALI - Burundi's government banned three UN investigators from its territory on Monday, deepening a row between the east African country and the international community over recurring political violence.

The brief letter from Foreign Affairs Minister Alain Aime Nyamitwe named three investigators linked to a report released last month, which identified officials suspected of ordering political opposition to be tortured or killed.

UN spokesperson Stephane Dujarric in New York reacted with dismay when questioned about the ban. "It's critical that Burundi, and every other country, cooperate fully with

the UN's human rights mechanism, and that is including working with those who represent it," he said. Burundian opponents of President Pierre Nkurunziza say his decision to

seek a third term last year violated the constitution and a peace agreement ended a civil war in 2005. The president says a court ruled that he cou run again and he won an election boycotted by most opposition parties. Last week, Burundi's government dismissed a UN decision to set up a commission of inquiry to identify perpetrators of killings and torture, saying the decision was based on a one-sided account of events in the African nation. Burundi also announced plans to withdraw from the Hague-based International Criminal Court, six months after the court's prosecutor said it will investigate violence that killed hundreds of people. Reuters

Museveni gives Shs100m to former opposition members

Kampala - Members of NRM in Mengo, Kampala, last week had running battles with Yoweni Museveni's guards as they tried to reach the president to hand him a petition.

The drama was captured during the launch of Muyoka Sacco last week where Museveni handed members Shs100m to mobilise themselves into income generating activities.

NRM members were challenging President Museveni's action to hand money to people, majority of whom were recently drafted into NRM from the Opposition.

Muyoka Sacco is composed of more than 3 000 members who were recruited by a former DP member Rose Kafeero ahead of the February 18 elections to consolidate NRM's support in Kampala.

However, Museveni told grumbling members, "this Sacco was for you to work and get out of poverty", adding that challenging the Shs100m "handover was bad manners". AFP

Italian PM seeks to avoid rift in party

ROME - Italian Prime Minister Matteo Renzi sought Monday to avoid a rift in his Democratic Party over an upcoming referendum on constitutional reforms.

The changes are aimed at increasing political stability in a country which has had 63 governments since 1945, with Renzi's future riding on the outcome of the December 4 plebiscite. For months, the centre-left Democratic Party has been split on the issue, with a minority of law-makers deeming the mooted reforms and the new electoral law which would accompany them to be dangerous to democracy.

In a bid to assuage the reforms' opponents within his own party, Renzi on Monday proposed a party committee be set up, including at least one member of the dissenting minority, to propose a new electoral law, but only after the December 4 referendum. However, one of the main voices among the naysayers, Gianni Cuperlo, warned he would still vote against the proposed constitutional amendments unless changes are made ahead of the poll. *Reuters*

Erdogan files complaint over German decision to drop comedian case

BERLIN - A lawyer for Tayyip Erdogan has filed a complaint about a German decision to drop a case against a comedian accused of offending the Turkish president with an obscene poem, prosecutors

The chief prosecutor in Koblenz will review the files on the case and rule on the complaint, the prosecutor's office in the western city of Mainz said on Monday.

Prosecutors announced last week they had not found sufficient evidence to suggest any criminal offence had been committed by comedian Jan Boehmermann or anyone else involved in making or broadcasting the piece. Erdogan had filed an initial complaint in March after Boehmermann read out a poem on a satirical show suggesting Erdogan engaged in bestiality and watched child pornography. The German Association of Journalists (DJV) on Monday criticised Erdogan's decision to file a further complaint. "The Turkish president is not only an active enemy of press freedom, but also a bad loser," DJV head Frank Ueberall said.

The case has damaged ties between
Ankara and Berlin, which were strained further in June after Germany's parliament
passed a resolution that declared the 1915
massacre of Armenians by Ottoman forces
to be a genocide. Reuters

Trump still alive, but Republican Party in tatters

WASHINGTON - After nearly 18 months of vitriolic campaigning and two incendiary presidential debates, it is clear the 2016 race for the White House is truly like no other.

The release of a 2005 video containing lewd and sexist comments made by

Republican nominee Donald Trump has further roiled his party, which was already in tatters and without a path forward. Now, many party stalwarts have abandoned their own candidate.

Here are the key lessons learned so far with four weeks to go before Americans go to the polls on November 8 for an election that will end with either Trump, 70, or Democratic rival Hillary

Clinton, 68, succeeding Barack Obama as US president.

1. Trump on the ropes but no KO (yet)

Team Trump breathed a relative sigh of relief on Monday after the second debate between the White House hopefuls.

On Saturday, one day after the bombshell release of the video showing Trump making aggressively sexual remarks about groping and forcing himself on women, it looked like the real estate mogul was one step away from political oblivion.

A cascade of repudiation from fellow Republicans flooded Twitter: one by one, party heavyweights including Senator John McCain, the 2008 presidential nominee, said they could no longer back Trump. Questions swirled: would Trump drop out of the race? Would his running mate Mike Pence leave the ticket to position himself for 2020?

Two days and one debate later, Trump seems on better footing. His combative debate performance - heavy on zingers, light on substance - appeared to have righted the ship. Pence, who said he was "offended" by Trump's comments, changed tack.

"Nobody is perfect," Pence told MSNBC. "I'm honoured to be standing shoulder to shoulder with him."

For Julian Zelizer, a Professor of history and public affairs at Princeton University, said "Clinton missed a knockout punch" during Sunday's debate. *Reuters*

Russia to create permanent naval base

MOSCOW - Russia intends to establish a permanent naval base on the site of an existing facility it leases at the Syrian port of Tartus, Russian Deputy Defence Minister Nikolai Pankov said on Monday, Russian news agencies reported. Pankov's statement is the latest sign that Moscow wants to expand its military footprint in Syria where it has been helping President Bashar al-Assad fight rebels since 2015. Moscow last week deployed S-300 surface-to air missiles to Tartus. "We will have a permanent naval base at Tartus," Pankov told Russian senators.

BERLIN - UN chief Ban Ki-moon says
Syrian President Bashar Assad's "failure of
leadership" caused the deaths of over 300
000 people, according to an interview
released on Monday. Asked by the German
broadcaster Deutsche Welle if he considered
Assad a mass murderer, Ban said that
question was for other institutions to answer.
He added, though: "It's true that because of
his failure of leadership so many people have
died, more than 300 000 people have been
killed". Ban also said he had urged US
Secretary of State John Kerry and Russia "to
restore the cessation of hostilities, so we can
deliver life-saving humanitarian assistance"."

UN rues failure to punish war crimes

GENEVA - A top UN human rights official renewed his call on Monday for an international probe into possible war crimes committed in Yemen, saying the "outrageous" weekend bombing on a funeral showed that violations continued unpunished. Zeid Ra'ad al Hussein, United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, said in a statement that countries belonging to the UN Human Rights Council had contributed to "a climate of impunity" in Yemen by failing to investigate adequately. *AFP*

... Top Republican won't defend Trump

WASHINGTON - Paul Ryan, the top Republican in the US Congress, said on Monday he would not defend Donald Trump nor campaign with him, plunging the Republican candidate's presidential bid deeper into crisis over his sexually aggressive remarks about women.

Ryan, Speaker of the House of Representatives, also signalled he was preparing for Democrat Hillary Clinton to win the White House in the November 8 presidential and congressional election.

In an emergency conference call with Republican lawmakers, Ryan said he would now focus on protecting the party's majorities in Congress, to ensure that Clinton does not get a "blank check" in the form of a Democrat-controlled Capitol Hill, a source familiar with the call said.

It is extremely rare for a House Speaker to turn his back on his party's presidential nominee. Ryan's move illustrated the extent of the upheaval triggered by the emergence on Friday of a video tape from 2005 showing Trump crudely bragging about groping women and

making unwanted sexual advances. Ryan, the country's highest ranking elected Republican, said he could not defend Trump nor campaign with him in the coming 30 days, the source said.

But he did not completely cut ties to the New York businessman, whose volatile campaign has created the Republican Party's biggest crisis in decades. Ryan went back on the conference call later to clarify he was not withdrawing his endorsement, a source said. Republican members of Congress are worried that Trump's campaign could ruin their chances of holding their majorities in the House and Senate in November and inflict longterm damage on the party. Ryan has been a frequent critic of Trump, who has never previously run for office.

Buffett hits back at Trump over tax comments

WASHINGTON Billionaire investor
Warren Buffett denied on
Monday an allegation by
Republican presidential
candidate Donald Trump
that he, like Trump, had
taken "a massive deduction" that allowed him to
avoid federal income taxes.

Buffett said he paid about \$1.85 million (R25.51 million) in income tax in 2015, and that returns for previous years were similar in respect to contributions, deductions and tax rates.

Buffett said he was being audited by the Internal Revenue Service but would have "no problem" in releasing his returns.

Trump has refused to release his tax returns, citing ongoing audits by the IRS.







'Not ready' Tiger Woods postpones comeback

NEW YORK - Tiger Woods rocked the golf world Monday after abruptly cancelling his long-awaited comeback, raising fresh questions about his ability to return to the highest levels of the sport he once

Just three days after the PGA Tour issued a statement trumpeting the former world number one's participation at the Safeway Open in California this week, Woods announced he was not ready to return from his 14-month injury layoff.

The 14-time major winner, 40, who has been out of action since undergoing surgery late last year to cure a long-standing back injury, said concerns over form - rather than fitness — were behind the decision to delay his comeback.

"After a lot of soul-searching and honest reflection, I know I am not yet ready to play on the PGA Tour or compete in Turkey," said Woods, who was also due to take part in next month's Turkish Airlines Open in Antalya.

New Banyana coach in 14 days - Jordaan

Sundowns spokesperson Thulani Thuswa told Times Live that the image of Bolt holding the shirt is in fact real.


"Usain and Sundowns are both sponsored by sports gear company Puma and I cannot fathom why people would think that the photo is not real. Why?"







Simelane, however, did mention he received reports that Mwase was attacked by a group of their fans after their goalless draw against Midas City last weekend at the Somhlolo National Stadium.

'We have gathered the coach was confronted by a group of fans after the match over the weekend and we suspect he somehow felt intimidated by actions of the fans.


We are still gathering more information about the alleged incident. We are calling our supporters to refrain such unpleasant behaviour which has led to the players getting threats from the supporters."

He said this was not the way to go. "We understand the team is currently

"We have parted ways with the coach following a disagreement as he later informed one of our officials he was longer part of the team after my meeting with him.
