



SWAZIBANK STOPS AUCTION OF DUMISA'S FARMS

SWAZIBANK has been granted an interim order to stop the sale of three farms by public auction where the late business tycoon Dumisa Dlamini was a sharehold-

The financial institution has claimed that it intends to protect its interests in the insolvent estate of the late business tycoon, which allegedly owes it over E27 million.

The auction sale was supposed to take place yesterday in the Lubombo region and conducted by Swazi Auctioneers. The three farms that had been advertised were Portion 69 and 76 of farm 161, Portion 12 (a portion of portion 9) of farm Pidardie No. 457 and portion/9 of farm Picardie No. 457. The farmsparblowned by Marshall Campbell, Matlock Estates and Pircadie Estates, respectively, it was alleged.

Swazi Bank yesterday filed an urgent application seeking an order to stop the auction sale on the grounds that it has substantial interests on

deceased. It was represented by lawyer Mangaliso Magagula from Magagula and Hlophe Attorneys and the matter was heard by Judge Mumcy Dlamini.

Swazi Bank Managing Director Zakhele Lukhele, in an affidavit, claimed that the bank was a creditor to Dlamini's insolvent estate and had proven a E13 860 905.23 claim against it, together with interests and

Claim

"The claim is based on a judgment of this honourable court (High Court) dated March 19, 1999. The value of the applicant's claim is now estimated to be in excess of the sum of E27 721 810.46.

When the late Dumisa passed away, the insolvent estate had not been wound up. To date the insolvent estate has not been would up. This is work Campbell, Matlock Estates and despite an order of the High Court dated August 10, 2012 directing the trustees of the insolvent estate to wind up the estate within a period of four months," Lukhele said.

He stated that it came to the bank's knowledge that the farms were being sold by public auction despite that no approval by the shareholders had been given. He said the bank had a vested interest in the insolvency

process.

Farms

He alleged that the farms which were to be sold by public auction, were owned by Marshall Campbell, Matlock Estates and Pircadie Estates, where Dlamini was a direct and indirect shareholder.

"This means that no sale of properties would be valid in the absence of approval of the disposal of the properties by the shareholders of Marshall Pircadie Estates. No such approval has been given," Lukhele said.

...Court order served a little too late

THE court order stalling the sale of the three farms by the companies where the late **Dumisa Dlamini had shares** was served late as one farm had already been sold.

According to the Director of Swazi Auctioneers, Sakhile Ndzimandze, they were not aware of the court process yesterday morning and proceeded to conduct the auction.

He said a deputy sheriff

served him with the papers while he was in the middle of the auction and one of the farms had already been sold to a purchaser.

"The order became academic only for one farm because we had already sold it as per the advertisements.

"However, we respected the court order and stopped the auctioning of the other two farms," Ndzimandze said.

No money for low cost road improvement

THE ministry of public works and transport has no money to proceed with the low-cost Probase road improvement method.

Public Works and Transport Minister Lindiwe Dlamini told members of the Government Assurance Committee (GAC) that they had submitted a E100 million budget request for the project for the current government financial year but got zero.

She said her ministry would submit the request again in the supplementary budget.

Members of parliament are so determined to see the country's roads improved such that they implored the minister to prepare the supplementary budget.

LOBAMBA Member of Parliament Michael Masilela says government must consider investing on the pro-base road infrastructure development as opposed to financing the re-gravelling pro-

MP Masilela told Public Works and Transport Minister Lindiwe Dlamini that re-gravelling the country's roads was too costly yet rains easily washed away those roads in a very short period of time.

Masilela asked the minister to compare the costs of re-gravelling with those required to extend the pro-base road network and subsequently opt for what was best for the country. Masilela said he was personally a vic-

tim of such re-gravelling exercises whereby he spent huge sums of

money from his pocket re-gravelling roads in his constituency only to be washed away by rains within a very short period.

In his opinion, he said paving the roads using the pro-base method was the way to go. The minister concurred with Masilela that indeed people appreciated the low-cost road tarring method. She said where it had already been implemented residents were hugely satisfied.

The minister stated that some of the country's roads, however, still needed to be re-gravelled periodically and it was for that reason they wanted to put up heavy machinery in all the country's regions to improve the regional roads.

MINISTER Lindiwe Dlamini promised that her ministry would consider including the Mhlaleni-Ludzeludze road via Mbikwakhe for tarring using the pro-base method.

This followed a request by Kwaluseni MP Mkhosi Dlamini who informed the minister the condition of the road needed urgent upgrading, especially considering the population residing along the

Minister Dlamini agreed with MP Dlamini that indeed the road warranted urgent upgrading, especially because of the population volumes that use the road.

Reserve

The minister, however, requested MP Dlamini to plead with his electorate to ensure that they do not utilise the road reserve.

She said roads were mainly destroyed by rain water and therefore it was imperative for communities to leave enough road reserves so that when road contractors improved the roads they did not face challenges in constructing road drainages.



IMBALI Foundation has strongly refuted long standing reports that connect Princess Sikhanyiso to a directorship position with one of the country's fairly new construction giants, Kukhanya Civil Engineering.

Kukhanya shot to fame when winning multi-million Emalangeni construction tenders, like the Sicunusa/Nhlangano Road, the resealing of the MR3 Road from Matsapha to Manzini and the joint venture construction of the International Convention Centre (ICC) at Ezulwini.

The country's big construction companies have always been Inyatsi, Stefanutti & Stocks, AG Thomas and Du-Van.

The record was set straight by Imbali Foundation's Israel Matsebula, who stated that the princess has never had any interests

in the construction industry.

"The princess has no plans to venture into construction so far, nor does she have any business dealings with Kukhanya or let alone showed any interest towards them," he said.

Assumptions

He warned the public, especially in the social networks, to refrain from circulating false assumptions about the princess as she has become the

"This has to stop because these people have no proof of such, if we were to get one of them and ask for proof of the lies they are spreading, things may turn sour, because they just talk without even considering the feelings

of the other person," he said. Matsebula added that they tried to let the rumours go with the wind, but because the lies continued to spread, they felt it prudent to address the misconception or deliberate lies, which are aimed at tarnishing her good name.

"The resealing of the Matsapha-Manzini highway by Kukhanya has created a lot of gossiping in social networks and the princess had her name dragged in the mud, for no apparent reason and we had to intervene," Matsebula said.

He urged people to get their facts straight before tainting anyone's name, especially in social networks.

"People may not understand howei aid T big of a criminal case libel and slander are.

"Should any of those social network users be tracked and be put into order, they would cry wolf."

Sigombeni chief's death suspicious - Relatives

FOUL play is suspected to be at play in the death of Sigombeni Chief Lomngeletjane Zwelithini Dlamini.

The late Dlamini was holding a position of being a Chief and a police officer when he died after a short illness at Mankayane Government Hospital.

The chief, who was married to Inkhosikati LaMasuku (Dumsile) and the late Inkhosikati LaMvubu (Sitile), has since passed away and left four children behind.

During the chief's memorial service yesterday at St Paul's, it transpired that relatives close to him believe there was foul play in his death.

Dr Musa Hlatjwako, who is related to the deceased, minced no words during the memorial as he stated there was no way Dlamini would have survived "uhlambe netingwenya kani akusiyo'

Hlatjwako stated in vernacular which can be loosely translated to he messed with the wrong people.

Hlatjwako stated that he warned the chief last year in November that he must move from where he was.

Hlatjwako stated that he was even called a fool for trying to warn the chief.

Hlatjwako vowed that whoever did what they did to the chief would never find peace in their lives.

Disputes

He stated that disputes were part and parcel of chiefdom life and there was no running away from it.

One speaker who also made his speech during the event stated that once an area loses its chief there was bound to be trouble as everyone would want to have a say in the running of things.

During the memorial, the late Chief was hailed as a very humble person who decided to join the police service even though he was hailing from an area that boasted wealth and would have been supported by his people even if he was not employed.

Temporary teachers meet with government

TEMPORARY teachers yesterday delivered a petition to the Ministry of Education and **Training Under Secretary** Macanjana Motsa, raising their grievances about not being paid according to their qualifications.

This transpired at Swaziland National Association of Teachers Centre during their meeting with the ministry of education and training, ministry of public service and the Teaching Service Commission.

In the petition, they raised grievances which included the payment of teachers which some have not received yet.

Deputy Secretary General of SNAT Sikelela Dlamini stated that the teachers also requested that the ministry must create degree posts in primary schools because there were fewer high schools in the country, which makes it hard for posts to be available. Motsa, in responding to the grievances raised by teachers, promised them that they would definitely receive their salaries this month.

The under secretary stated that if someone is left out it would be because of technical glitches in the banking systems.

Qualifications

However, even though the teachers are going to get paid they are concerned their qualifications are not taken into consideration.

The teachers stated that to make things worse, government has already started deducting the scholarship money from their salaries. For those who enrolled for the PGCSE course, a sum of El 040 is deducted from their salaries while for others E700 taken.

The teachers said taking such a huge chunk from their salaries was not fair when considering that they were not even paid according to their qualifications.

All they were asking for was for the government to be patient with them and start deducting the scholarship money once they were paid accordingly.

Contracts

Temporary teachers and degree holders at primary schools were told to get their contracts from the ministry of eucation and training.

The teachers stated that their contracts had a lot of loopholes. During the meeting it was also revealed that the teachers do not even have a copy of the contracts they were made to sign.

It is said after signing the contracts are taken back which shows they are not meant to be read and clearly understood by them.

The teachers were told that the reason for this was for the TSC executive to also sign them.

The teachers were told that if they wanted the contracts they could come and get them from the minister.

This did not go down well with the teachers who felt this was a strategy of identifying those with complaints about the contracts.





70-year-old woman gives birth to first child


INDIA - Doctors in India on Wednesday raised ethical and health concerns after a woman gave birth to her first child in her 70s, following two years of IVF treatment.

Daljinder Kaur gave birth last month to a healthy boy after falling pregnant by her 79-year-old husband, following fertility treatment at a northern Indian clinic.

Kaur said the couple, married for 46 years, were overjoyed at finally having their first child after enduring years of taunts in a country where infertility is sometimes seen as a curse from God.

"I feel blessed to be able to hold my own baby. I had lost hope of becoming a mother ever," Kaur told AFP from her home in Amritsar city. "I used to feel empty. There was so much loneliness."

Kaur put her age at about 70
- a common scenario in India, where many people don't have birth certificates - while the clinic said in a statement she was 72. But fertility expert Sunil Jindal raised questions about the future of a child born to elderly parents, as well as

health issues for the mother.

"There are ethical issues. In my opinion it is unfair to do such a procedure on a woman who is over 60," Jindal told AFP. "The sheer fact that a woman in her 70s has to carry the weight of a child in her womb for nine months is stressful. Then the question comes how are the parents going to look after the baby?

That is also quite a task."
The climic, in the northern state of Haryana, told AFP the couple's baby was conceived using Kaur's egg and her husband's spenm after two previous unsurenessful attempts.

Cabinet throws out SPPRA's board members

CABINET has refused to reappoint board members of the **Swaziland Public Procurement** Regulatory Agency (SPPRA) who took the government to court recently over a motor vehicle tender.

Finance Minister Martin Dlamini told the Government Assurance Committee (GAC) yesterday that his proposal to have the board members reappointed was rejected by cabinet on the grounds that they failed to

The minister said cabinet was shocked that the SPPRA board members had the audacity to take their employer, the government, to court instead of engaging them if they saw issues differently. Minister Martin Dlamini says the accusation that he was frustrating operations of certain parastatals

falling under his ministry was unfounded.

The minister told the GAC that boards of directors for all the parastatals under his ministry had been appointed. He mentioned the Swaziland Revenue Authority, Sincephetelo Motor Vehicle Accidents Fund, SwaziBank and FINCORP.

The only board that he was working on, he said, was the SPRA because he had to consider other members for it.

Kobla Quashie to audit auditor general's office

FINANCE Minister Martin Dlamini says auditing firm, Kobla Quashie has been appointed to audit the office of the auditor general.

Minister Dlamini told members of the GAC that the auditing firm was the only one that tendered its application when government advertised the job. Dlamini said the company would be given a three-year contract to carry out

the job, which he said would also include auditing the treasury.

The minister said his ministry has fulfilled all the resolutions of the House of Assembly by appointing parastatals' board members and an auditing firm to audit the auditor general's office. Somntongo MP Sandile.

Nxumalo wondered why the minister waited until he was summoned and instructed by par-

liament to perform duties he was appointed for in the first place. The MP wanted the minister to explain why the auditing of the auditor general's office had to be sanctioned by parliament, demanding to know what regional and international practices were. MP Nxumalo said as much as the AG's office was established by the country's constitution, there was no need for

the constitution to expressly state that the office should be audited yearly.

Minister Dlamini concurred with MP Nxumalo that indeed it was international practice that audits were done yearly.

Mtfongwaneni MP Mjuluko Dlamini demanded written proof from the minister that the board had been appointed as well as the auditing company.

The minister offered to bring the documentary evidence before the end of yesterday.

SPTC employee fails to stop DC proceedings

A Swaziland Posts and **Telecommunications** Corporation (SPTC) employee has lost a challenge to set aside procession of a disciplinary hearing against her just because her line manager had been sidelined in investigating her charges.


Zanele Masilela had been charged after she had allegedly made statements which were not favourable to her employer during a meeting.

She claimed that the disciplinary proceedings were not in line with the corporation's disciplinary code and procedure, therefore unfair.

She argued that the chairman of the disciplinary hearing was not fair to have ruled that the code was not binding and could be diverted from.

The matter was heard by Industrial Court Nkosinathi Nkonyane and he issued a ruling on the matter yesterday. She was represented by lawyer Bongani Dlamini in the matter while Derrick Jele appeared on behalf of SPTC.

Masilela argued that the disciplinary code and procedure was flouted in that her supervisor and line manager



were not involved in the investigation and framing of her charges. The corporation opposed the application on the grounds that the code itself stipulated that it was a guide for handling cases of misconduct and was not binding.

Masilela argued that the code was made in terms of the Industrial Relations Act, which allowed parties to enter into lawful and binding recognition and procedural agreements. She also said the code was by law negotiated and agreed upon, therefore, became a legally binding document to all stakeholders.

Judge Nkonyane, in his ruling, said there was no evidence before court that the disciplinary code was a product of collective bargaining and it was agreed upon by the parties and signed.

"Even if a disciplinary code is a product of collective agreement, it can be deviated from in exceptional and appropriate circumstances, if for example, the manager who is supposed to investigate and charge the accused employee is disqualified for certain reasons," Nkonyane said.

He said in such circumstances, the court would not interfere with the disciplinary hearing's ruling. He said in Masilela's case, her managers were disqualified because they had been involved in the meeting where she made the statements she was alleged to have uttered.

He said those were exceptional circumstances warranting deviation from the company's code.

Her application was dismissed and no order as to costs was made.

Escaped convict busted before crossing to Moza

A convict who escaped from the watchful eye of Correctional Services officers was arrested before he could cross the Mhlumeni Border Post enroute to Maputo, Mozambique.

The convict got more than he had bargained for when he hitched a lift from a man who later reported him to his superiors, which led to his arrest.

He reportedly hitched a lift from Jeremiah Hlatshwako (53) of Siteki at the Lukhula Foot and Mouth Disease check-point. Hlatshwako was approached by the uniformed convict who asked for a lift to Siteki and he became suspicious when he noted there was no correctional officer on sight.

When asked why he was alone while on uniform the escaped convict told Hlatshwako that he had

just been released from prison and needed transport to Siteki.

On suspicion that the man might be on the run, Hlatshwako drove to the site where a new correctional centre is under construction at Lukhula to verify the authenticity of the story. Upon arrival and after relaying the scenario, correctional officers on site immediately embarked on a search for the fugitive together with Hlatshwako.

After a lengthy search, the fugitive was apprehended along Sitsatsaweni on his way to Mhlumeni Border Post. The fugitive told the police that he was going to meet his family in Maputo, Mozambique. He was rearrested and charged with new charges, including escaping from lawful custody, malicious damage to property. The offender allegedly damaged Hlatshwako's car in a scuffle while resisting arrest. He was also charged with theft in that he had stolen clothes from one homestead at Mzilikazi near Siteki to conceal his identity from the correctional officers.

The offender in question was serving an 11-year sentence and was due to be released in October next year. However, that will no longer happen as he was now facing new three charges.

Correctional Services boss honours Hlatshwako

HIS Majesty's Correctional Services Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase has praised Hlatshwako for his heroism which helped in the re-arrest of an escaped offender.

Ntshangase presented Hlatshwako with a certificate of appreciation acknowledging his assistance and good work in bringing the escaped offender back to custody.

Ntshangase said: "Without Hlatshwako's assistance in this regard, it was going to be very difficult for officers to locate the whereabouts of the offender because he was nabbed while trying to skip the country to Mozambique to meet his family."

The commissioner general commended Hlatshwako, saying he was a true patriotic Swazi citizen who would risk everything to save the country from unlawful acts. Ntshangase noted that Hlatshwako was a very responsible person who is also vigilant in nature.

Sacrificed

"He sacrificed his car, fuel, time and energy in an effort to help the department recapture the escaped inmate," said Ntshangase.

In addition to this, he thanked Hlatshwako for rushing an injured correctional officer to hospital and for driving the offender to the police station in Siteki to face charges. He then presented Hlatshwako with a certificate of recognition plus E1 500 as a token of appreciation for the good work.

Ntshangase said the financial resources would assist Hlatshwako in repairing his car damaged by the offender. He said the money came from the Prison Officers' Reward Fund.

"I wish people like Hlatshwako would multiply so that the country benefits from their distinguished service," he said.

The commissioner general warned offenders against escaping from lawful custody, saying it does not help them except adding more charges to their initial sentences.

Siteki transport operators, association smoke peace-pipe

THE local kombi and mini bus association has finally met with public transport operators to discuss their grievances.

The local office and the operators have been on a stand-off, which saw the latter suspending payment of subscriptions to the association.

The operators pointed out irregularities in the running of the office, saying the executive committee was refusing to call meetings to report on its expenditures. They had resolved to suspend their subscriptions until their grievances had been attended to.

Yesterday, the committee convened a meeting with the operators where some of the grievances were amicably resolved.

These included that the committee will now present a detailed expenditure report to the operators on a periodic interval, which is yet to be agreed upon. Another issue which was discussed was the hike of transport fees for the Manzini and Simunye routes.

The two routes did not implement the new fares which were introduced late last year. The operators wanted to know what the local

office has done to resolve the issues which resulted to the new fares not being implemented.

Speaking after the meeting, Secretary of the committee, Cromwell Shongwe, reported that it was a success as both parties were able to reach common ground.

In an effort to have all the operators' grievances resolved, Shongwe said they had agreed to meet with the buses committee to discuss the issue of fares.

It is understood that operators resolved not to implement the new transport fees after they cited unworkable conditions and differences between the two committees. It was stated that kombi owners were giving unfair competition to bus owners by picking up customers along the way while buses were also accused of charging very low prices.

Another issue which was discussed was that of the Maphungwane-Siteki gravel road which is in a bad condition.

asked the local office to make efforts to have the road attended to as a matter of urgency.

Shongwe said these were some of the things which the committee hoped to have sorted out by next week.

"The committee and transport operators had a number of agreements and some of them were implemented immediately," said Shongwe.

He further reported that the operators have also agreed to resume paying their subscriptions in the normal way.

THE public has been advised to get flu shots as the winter season comes to light.

Those advised on doing so are the elderly people, children and diabetics as they are said to have a weak immune system. This was said by Director of Health Dr Vusi Magagula, who mentioned that the public is always advised on doing

"Some people are more at risk from complications of influenza than others and are recommended to get a flu shot each year," Magagula explained.

Conditions

Children from six months to the age of five are recommended to take such, as well as pregnant women, elderly Swazis from age 65, travellers, people living abroad and those with existing health conditions e.g. diabetes.

"However, some people are not advised to take such shots as they are either younger than six months or allergic to flu shots or of any of its ingredients," he warned.

People are therefore warned on ensuring that they talk to the doctor THE FOLLOWING TRIVALENT FLU VACCINES ARE AVAILABLE:

 Standard-dose trivalent shots that are manufactured using virus grown in eggs. There are several different flu shots of this type available, and they are approved for people of different ages. Some are approved for use in people as young as 6 months of age. Most flu shots are given with a needle. One standard dose trivalent shot also can be given with a jet injector, for persons aged 18 through 64

A high-dose trivalent shot, approved for people 65 and older.

A trivalent shot containing virus grown in cell culture, which is approved for

A recombinant trivalent shot that is egg-free, approved for people 18 years

THE QUADRIVALENT FLU VACCINE PROTECTS AGAINST TWO INFLUENZA A VIRUSES AND TWO INFLUENZA B VIRUSES. THE FOLLOWING QUADRIVALENT FLU VACCINES ARE AVAILABLE:

"It is best to get the vaccine before the winter season starts, which is anytime from now, but people can still take some way into the season," he said.

viruses

The flu shot is a vaccine given with a needle, usually in the arm. The seasonal flu shot protects against the three or four influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the upcoming season.

Types of flu shot available for the 2015/16 flu season:

- Traditional flu vaccines made to protect against three different flu viruses (called 'trivalent' vaccines) are available. In addition, flu vaccines made to protect against four different flu viruses (called 'quadrivalent' vaccines) also are available.
- Trivalent flu vaccine protects against two influenza A viruses (an H1N1 and an H3N2) and an influenza B virus.

Ensuring the integration of environmental concerns into Swaziland's development

ahead of SA in digital migration

SWAZILAND is ahead of South Africa in terms of digital migration as the neighbouring country has not yet started the sale of the set-top boxes needed for this process to be successful.

This was revealed by ICASA Content Manager Mamedupe Kgatshe on Wednesday.

ICASA is Independent Communications Authority of South Africa. It is responsible for regulating the communications sector of the Republic.

Kgatshe was responding to a question that was posed by Channel S Director Qhawe Mamba, who wanted to know the progress made by South Africa in terms of digital migration.

"How far has South Africa gone in terms of the digital migration policy?" Mamba asked.

"South Africa is still behind in terms of digital migration because the set-top boxes are not yet in the market. I can say Swaziland is ahead of us in terms of digital migration," Kgatshe said.

She said set-top boxes were

still to be launched by ICASA adding that the digital migration would open about 15 South African **Broadcasting Corporation** (SABC) television channels as opposed to the 20 expected to be opened in Swaziland.-

Kgatshe advised the broadcasters, independent producers, Swaziland Communications Commission (SCCOM) and other stakeholders to come together to ensure they feed the channels with local content. She emphasised on political will that had to be

displayed in order for the exercise to be successful. She said a lot of investment had to be made to come up with infrastructure that would make this exercise successful.

She advised the broadcasters like Swazi TV to consider engaging SABC for advice on how to increase local content from 19 percent to a better percentage. She highlighted though that such would come at an affordable price. She said by so doing, they could find that producing local content would not be as expensive as they thought MAKING

MMM SA COLLAPSES, STARTS AFRE

THE controversial "donation platform" and alleged Ponzi scheme, MMM South Africa has collapsed and rebooted its system amid what it calls a "media panic".

In a notice posted to participants of the scheme, the group said persecution against MMM organised by the mass media has provoked a panic, which has forced the scheme to reboot and start all over again.

The group's administration said the scheme's currency, 'Mavros', named after the scheme's founder, convicted Russian fraudster, Sergey Mavrodi had been frozen and were impossible

The MMM web administrator blamed the collapse of the system on media reports and South African banks, which it alleges have hurt and robbed millions of people who were part of the scheme.

The scheme said it has started over with a clean sweep, with a plan to compensate users for any Mavro funds which were frozen.

The "old" version of the Mavro currency will be 'bought out' through trades of the "new" version of the currency, where equal value would be paid out to participants over six months, using 10% of total trade, effectively placing a debt burden on all participants. The notice popped up on participants' dashboards over the weekend, but was no longer appearing by Tuesday, according to users.

THE NOTICE WAS CAPTURED AND POSTED ON SOCIAL MEDIA:

DEAR PARTICIPANTS!

Unfortunately, the persecution against MMM organised by the mass media has provoked a panic. We have been working in South Africa for almost 2 years and we have millions of members. During all that time, we had no complaints and accusations from participants, every-

thing was paid to everyone in time and in full amount, by 30% per month. We held charity events and helped children. We did a lot of useful things for people! Well, who was suffering from this?

The bankers and the adherents of the current unjust financial system planned and brought all these crazy investigations and persecution in the mass media.

"The only thing which prevents the investigation is the fact that non of the participants reported to the police".

If there are no complaints, and everybody is happy, then what is the investigation for? What is the subject? Did not they understand the consequences?

Did not they understand that their irresponsible actions would hurt people? Millions of people! Well, try oppressing any bank, even the most reliable one, in the same way, and

SD faced with peanuts shortage

SWAZILAND is currently experiencing a shortage of legumes, especially peanuts which has hit hard on vendors who live by selling them.

Swazis have now resorted to buying them in Mozambique and South Africa. Currently, the country is having a shortage of beans,

lentils, peas and peanuts. The problem is not only affecting the vendors but also business owners. Most of the vendors claim the prices in Mozambique have hiked up and they were now paying double of what they were used to locally, including transport and taxes at the border post.

They mentioned that they were now facing challenges with the National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBoard) which

they should buy. They voiced their frustration in the way they were treated at the border posts where they said some of their stuff was confiscated because it was more than what they could import to the country. Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati confirmed that the country was affected by the shortage of legumes.

"It is true we are facing a challenge with legumes as the production has dropped drastically over the years due to the current

POLIO DID NOT STOP ME-AMBASSADOR

POLIO Ambassador Ntobeko Nkambule said being affected by Polio while he was a toddler did not stop him from pursuing his dreams.

Nkambule was speaking at a seminar at Happy Valley celebrating 27 years of Swaziland being polio-free recently.

The polio ambassador was the last polio case in Swaziland in 1989. Nkambule, who is a teacher by profession, stated that polio is real and stressed that it is important that children were vaccinated against the disease.

He further took a pledge to take responsibility to advocate and sensitise the com-

munity on immunisation to achieve the desired goal of polio eradication.

He told the meeting that despite challenges of living with disability, he still managed to complete his education and further obtained his BSc degree, majoring in Mathematics and Chemistry at the University of Swaziland.

He is currently studying Economics at UNISA.

The seminar was officially opened by Deputy Director of Health Services, Rejoice Nkambule. Nkambule emphasised the usage of science in polio eradication and other child health interventions, programming and social determinants of health.

WHO EPI Officer Lonkululeko Khumalo explained that there has been no imported or indigenous wild polio virus case in the country in the last 27 years.

Importation

She pointed out, however, that importation of wild polio virus (WPV) cannot be prevented until global polio eradication is achieved but its spread within the country can be controlled.

She emphasised that detection of wild polio virus in a polio-free country is a public

health emergency.

"It is against this background that the World Health Organisation (WHO) supported the country to develop anoutbreak preparedness and response plan. This plan providesguidance in case of an importation of WPV or detection of WPV case in order to maintain the polio free status," she said.

Khumalo went on to explain that the country has an active surveillance system in place for detection of poliovirus where all Acute Flaccid Paralysis cases are reported and investigated immediately and tested for poliovirus.

As soon as a case of WPV is isolated, an immediate

investigation is done commencing within 72 hours to identify the scope of the response activities, based on such factors as the extent of transmission, AFP surveillance quality, major transit routes, international borders and origin of the WPV case.

"Despite these achievements it should be noted that in Swaziland some children are still missed with immunization due to numerous reasons. We encourage parents and caretakers to bring children for immunisation to sustain and strengthen the gains made," Khumalo said.

Swaziland joined the rest of the African region in commemorating African Vaccination Week (AVW)

and brought 27 years of being Polio free on its cards.

This year's commemoration was held under the theme: "Close the Immunization Gap. Stay Polio Free!". Polio (poliomyelitis) mainly affects children under five years of age. One in 200 infections

leads to irreversible paralysis. Polio cases worldwide have decreased by over 99% since 1988, from an estimated 350 000 cases then, to 74 reported cases in 2015. Afghanistan and Pakistan are the only two countries remaining with the polioendemic. In Swaziland, the last polio case was clinically diagnosed and reported in

Father disputes paternity of two children

Stories by Jozane Maziya Magistrate's Court

A man appearing before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati has told the court that he has no assurance that all three of the children he is being asked to support are his biological offspring.

Sabelo Mkhonta* appeared for a maintenance case brought by one Gciniwe Ngwenya* in that he (the respondent) had not made any contribution to assist her in raising the three children whom the applicant (Gciniwe) says are all fathered by the respondent.

Asked whether or not he disputes paternity of the children, Mkhonta said: "If she says three then I can agree that one is mine but I have no assurances that all three are mine."

He was then informed by the magistrate that if he disputed paternity, he must provide the court with evidence that he is not the biological father of the said children in the form of a paternity

The applicant made a request for E1 000 in

monthly contributions from the respondent.

When asked how much he would be able to contribute the respondent told the court that he would not be able to contribute a cent to which Magistrate Vilakati responded.

"You have to contribute towards the children's maintenance."

Mkhonta, however, claimed that he is

unemployed and it is for that reason that he could not make a contribution.

However, Magistrate Vilakati warned the respondent against using unemployment as an excuse for not supporting his children. "You-cannot just fold your arms and say I am unemployed."

Mkhonta was asked how he feeds himself and he told the court the court that his wife

is employed and she pays for everything. He was ordered to contribute E1 000 per month towards the maintenance of all three children, which has to be paid at the department of social welfare.

DESPITE an order from Magistrate Vilakati for Mkhonta to contribute E1 000 a month towards the maintenance of his children he told court that he was not sure if he would manage.

He asked the court: "What happens if I do not pay?" Magistrate Vilakati responded by saying, "then the law will take its place."

Still not satisfied with the ruling to pay the monthly contributions Mkhonta asked the court:

"Why not let the law take

its place right now because I will not be able to pay.'

Magistrate Vilakati told the respondent that it was unfortunate because the children were innocent and it would not serve the children any good if their father was arrested because he would still be unable to make any contributions from a prison cell.

The applicant was then ordered to report the respondent if he failed to make the ordered contributions.

The magistrate also



advised the respondent to try first and then complain

Squatters face 60 days detention

MAHAMBA Gorge wants a body of a man who was a squatter in its farm exhumed because it was buried in defiance of a court order.

This has come after a family that was allowed to stay as a squatter in the Mahamba Gorge's farm at Gege in the Shiselweni region buried a dead man inside the farm despite being stopped by the High Court.

Stephen Sibandze was allegedly buried on the remaining extent of Portion A of farm Johannesloop No. 19 belonging to the Mahamba Gorge, despite that the family had been served with a court order barring it from conducting the event inside the

The outlet has filed an urgent application seeking an order to have the deceased's eldest daughter Nicholine Lushaba (nee Sibandze) and one Pat Mdluli to be charged with contempt

of court and be put to gaol for 60

The company has also applied for an order directing Lushaba and Mdluli to exhume the body of the deceased from its farm and bury it elsewhere. Lawyer Derrick Jele from Robinson Bertram Attorneys represented Mahamba Gorge in the matter.

Alleged

Sandile Simelane, Mahamba Gorge's Managing Director, has alleged that the late Stephen was one of squatters in the farm which had been earmarked for the establishment of a game lodge.

He claimed all the squatters had been barred from conducting burials inside the farm.

Simelane stated that the court order was issued on May 7, 2016 interdicting the family from burying the deceased inside the farm.

The funeral had been earmarked to take place on May 8, 2016 and was

served to the family members of the deceased, specifically, Lushaba, on the same day. He alleged that Lushaba was served by Shiselweni Deputy Sheriff Xolani Mkhonta.

"I am advised that the court order is clear that the first respondent (Lushaba) and/or all those acting under her behest are interdicted and restrained from burying the deceased in the applicant's (Mahamba Gorge) property.

In full defiance of the court order, Lushaba and Mdluli proceeded with the funeral of the deceased in the applicant's property in the morning of May 8, 2016.

Guilty

They are therefore guilty of contempt of court in the circumstances," Simelane said.

He also submitted that their conduct in proceeding with the funeral undermined the dignity and authority of the court. He also submitted that defiance of court orders was unacceptable because it had the potential to give rise to situations where citizens took the law into their own hands. He applied that they should be committed to gaol for 60 days for defying the order of court.

"Alternatively, if the court is not minded to grant a committal order, then first respondent be ordered to exhume the body of the deceased and bury him elsewhere and not in the applicant's property.

The applicant also seeks an order for costs at punitive scale against the first and second respondents for intentionally defying the order of

THE 52nd Regional Programme Meeting (RPM 52) of the WHO African Region began on Wednesday

She thanked participants for their continued support for the reform process and informed them that adocument entitled "The Africa Transformation Programme, 2015 - 2020; a Vision for Universal Health Coverage" has just

been published. The document articulates a vision for health and development that aims to address health inequities and inequalities in the

"We will hold ourselves accountable to these deliverables", she said, adding "we cannot relent on our efforts to become the WHO Secretariat in the African Region that our Member States and stakeholders want".

Referring to Health Security, Dr Moeti said the Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) epidemic in West Africa was no longer a public health event of international concern. Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone have capacities and systems in place to respond to flare-ups. She congratulated the three representatives and their teams for the commitment and excellent work in stopping the EVD epidemic. The Health

Security and Emergencies (HSE) Cluster is supporting 19 targeted countries to enhance the level of preparedness for Ebola. The cluster is also coor dinating support for the response to a number of outbreaks and emergencies including meningitis and Lassa Fever in West Africa; cholera in Tanzania, DR Congo and Zambia; a major outbreak of yellow fever in Angola which has since spread to other countries, notably DR Congo, Kenya, Namibia; drought and El Nino in East and Southern Africa.

The regional director observed that the WHO African region is contributing actively to the design of a new WHO Health Emergencies Programme which aims to ensure standardisation, predictability and interoperability across the three levels of the Organisation.

Swazi Administration Act outdated - Police boss

THE 1950 Swazi Administration Act which is meant to give powers and accord authority to chiefs has been deemed as inadequate in today's world by National Commissioner of Police Isaac M Magagula.

The national commissioner stated that this Act needed to be replaced

with a more comprehensive legislation. The police have roped in the Attorney General's Office to help them in dealing with disputes involving traditional leaders.

With police being accused of taking sides or being partisans when dealing with chieftaincy disputes, boundary disputes and evictions, regional commissioners and commanders have held a workshop that will enlighten the Royal Swaziland Police on how to deal with such issues

The focus of the workshop, which is held at Matsapha Police College, is to find a common understanding on the operational role of police in areas such as assisting and protecting the authority and dignity of traditional leaders, burial sites disputes and evictions as a consequence to court or traditional authority orders.

Magagula stated that problems arise in particular that the 1950 Swazi

Administration Act which was meant to give powers and accord authority to Chiefs' authority was now proving inadequate. The workshop will be dealing with considerations on replacing the act with a more comprehensive legislation tailored on the lines of the 1998 Swazi

Administration Order which for some reason could not see the light of the day. Magagula stated that despite the challenges they were faced with they

were thankful of the Attorney General's Office which always helped them in their quest to strike a balance between modernity and custom in policing a diverse and dynamic environment in Swazi Society.

Kunene stated the Act being used was very old and hoped that chiefs who are in parliament would lobby for it to be amended so that it becomes efficient in today's era.

Dlamini was making a presentation about the programme content of the national broadcaster.

Revealed

He revealed that most of the station's programme content was local. He said the SiSwati Channel (SBIS1) had a local content of 98 percent, while the English Channel (SBIS2) had a content of 80 percent.

During the question-and-answer session of his presentation, Dlamini told those who were present at the workshop that they had a problem with repeating programmes at the stations.

"We had an experience where a voice of a former employee of ours was used to introduce our news bulletin.

What is unfortunate is that she has passed away.

When we continued with her voice as an introduction, we were called by her relatives telling us that we were inflicting pain on them by playing the introduction," Dlamini said.

He, however, did not state the name of that radio personality whose voice was used to introduce the news bulletin. In the English Channel of SBIS, a voice of the late Nomvula Motsa was used to introduce the news bulletin. It would say: "From the news desk, we present local and international

news."

Dlamini was responding to concerns from the participants at the workshop. They wanted programmes, especially those that were considered to be educational.

This, according to the participants, would be done to educate even those who would not be able to listen to the live broadcast of the programme.

THE KINGDOM OF SWAZILAND
STATEMENT TO THE HUMAN RIGHTS
COUNCIL WORKING GROUP BY SENATOR
EDGAR E. HILLARY MINISTER OF JUSTICE
AND CONSTITUTIONAL AFFAIRS

Honourable President, Representatives of the Member States, Observer states, Ladies and Gentlemen,

1. INTRODUCTION:

- 1.1 I am greatly honoured to lead the delegation of the Kingdom of Swaziland to the Universal Periodic Review (UPR) of my country, and to present our National Report to the Working Group today. On behalf of His Majesty's Government let me take this opportunity to congratulate His Excellency Choi Kyong-lim on his election as President of the Human Rights Council.
- 1.2 The Kingdom of Swaziland greatly appreciates the opportunity provided by the UPR mechanism to reflect and assess, in a self-critical manner, our achievements as well as identify existing gaps and challenges in the promotion and protection of human rights in our Kingdom.
- 1.3 This is also an occasion to share best practices and bring about further improvement through constructive dialogue and international co-operation. We are confident that the outcome of this review will contribute towards Swaziland's efforts in further enhancing the enjoyment of the full spectrum of human rights of our people. We approach the whole review process with an open and a positive mind and are keen to engage with all delegations to receive and consider their constructive comments and recommendations.
- 1.4 Like many countries in Southern Africa, Swaziland's resources are reaching their limits. The recent drought currently experienced in the Kingdom of Swaziland has hit hard on its economy outlook. This has historically diminished the ability of the government to efficiently underwrite some of the human rights that have financial implications. It has greatly constrained the ability to expand safety nets and other social protection systems.
- 1.5 Despite the diversity and complexity of the challenges, the Government and people of Swaziland have remained firm and determined to reverse the situation and advance development forward by tracking the economy back to the right and sustainable path in line with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) adopted by the UN in 2015. Seeing that Swaziland's best asset is her people, Government has introduced a number of measures aimed at safeguarding the lives and livelihoods of the poor and vulnerable groups while at the same time keeping intact sound mechanisms to accelerate economic growth and recovery.
- 1.6 Innovative and creative programmes that selectively target vulnerable groups such as orphans, women, children, the disabled and the elderly have been put in place to rectify social imbalances and meet the pre-set targets for the Millennium Development Goals (2015). The included: establishment of the Youth Enterprise Fund, Regional Development Fund, Poverty Reduction Fund, subsidized farming inputs, establishment of Orphans and Vulnerable Children (OVC) grant, the elderly grant, Free Primary Education (FPE), Free Ante and Post Natal care for women and children and Government Medical Aid Scheme for the poor called the Phalala Fund. Furthermore, measures to promote youth employment, regional and agricultural development as well as women's empowerment projects were put in
- 1.7 Since the last review (2011), the Swaziland Government has continued to formulate and implement policies aimed at improving the quality of life

of everyone in the country. These policies are included in the report mainly in paragraphs 64, 65, 67 and 69 and just to mention a few:

- (a) A National Strategic Framework (NSF) 2009-2014 and Extended National Strategic Framework (ENSF) 2014-2018. These provide a blueprint for multi sectoral action for HIV.
- (b) A National Parliamentary Strategy on HIV and AIDS (2009-2014) is being reviewed. A new strategy covering the period 2016-2021 is being developed. The objective is to enhance the engagement and effective participation of law makers in the national response to HIV and AIDS in Swaziland.
- (c) A National Male Circumcision Policy (2009). The aim of the Policy is to scale up male circumcision as a proven HIV prevention strategy, alongside other prevention interventions. Similarly a national male circumcision programme (2014-2018) has been developed to accelerate access scale-up male circumcision from 27 percent in 2014 to 80 percent by 2018.

- 2.1 The report at hand is a result of a process that involved the setting up of a multi-stakeholder Committee that was tasked with data collection, collation, conducting consultations and verification process. The Committee was chaired by the Ministry of Justice and it included the Prime Minister's office, Deputy Prime Minister's office, Ministry of Labour, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education, Academia, Non-Governmental Organizations and Civil Society Organisations.
- 2.2 Following the appointment of the Committee, a workshop was held in order to provide technical assistance on the preparation of Swaziland's Second National Report. This workshop was conducted with the assistance of the Regional Office for Southern Africa of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights and the United Nations country team. The forum provided an opportunity for the stakeholders to reflect on the common understanding of the UPR process and to discuss the national experiences on the last UPR, implementation and progress made on the recommendations.
- 2.3 The Committee then started with data collection from all relevant sectors, each member of the Committee being a representative of and responsible for consultation within their respective sector. The Committee then narrowed down to a working group which was responsible for consolidating all the inputs and this led to the first draft of the report. The draft was then circulated to all stakeholders for their inputs once again; thereafter a validation workshop was held with all stakeholders and in this workshop further input was made. After the validation workshop, the report was presented to Cabinet, before submission to the UN.

The Constitution also establishes an independent Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration whose mandate is large very light to complaints concerning allegediviolations of dyndamental human rights and freedoms. The Gammission has been receiving complaints of alleged violations of fundamental human rights. Presently there are 86 complaints, of which 69 of these are under investigation and complaints referred to other state institutions are 11. Some of the complaints have resulted in the Commission appearing in court as an intervening party in order to protect and promote human rights.

The commission has made significant strides towards implementing its mandate despite chal-

lenges. It is anticipated that there will be achievements and adequate allocation of resources to enable the commission to continue its mandate effi-

Significant progress has been achieved towards strengthening the commission. This includes the recruitment of 8 key staff members, 5 of whom focus on the investigative and the legal framework of the commission. The commission has developed a 5 year strategy and is working on the Human Rights and Public Administration Bill 2011, to ensure full adherence to the Paris Principles. Accreditation by the International Accreditation Committee (ICC) is one of the

has been collaborating with the Commission to ensure that the independence articulated in Section 166 of the Constitution is adhered to.

The newly established secretariat will enhance the Commission to achieve its constitutional mandate of promoting and protecting human rights, ensuring equitable access to public services for all and fostering leadership that is accountable to all people.

4. RIGHTS OF CHILDREN

The country enacted a comprehensive and protective piece of legislation for children in 2012 (Child Protection and Welfare Act 2012). This legislation seeks to provide protection for children from abuse and to promote their welfare and best interests.

The legislation was benchmarked against the most important legal instruments of children's rights

The Act recognises emerging child protection and welfare challenges brought on by a high HIV prevalence leading to many children being orphaned. Importantly, this legislation domesticates international instruments on child rights for Swaziland. The Government of Swaziland gave careful consideration in drafting the Act to give effect to its international obligations.

Over and above this legislation, the country has a children's policy which also provides a clear position of the policy statements that illustrate prioritisation of the protection and promotion of children's rights, in particular vulnerable children.

Under the strong government social protection program, government offers an Orphan and Vulnerable Children's (OVC) grant which caters for their education.

The Government of Swaziland has ensured free primary education for all Swazi children as enshrined in the Constitution and the Free Primary Education Act, 2012.

The Free Primary Education programme is designed to remove barriers and increase access to primary education for all school-going age children. It provides relevant quality education and eliminates all forms of disparities and irregularities in primary education. It is calculated to eradicate illiteracy and to equip every child with basic skills and knowledge in an endeavor to alleviate poverty.

This is in line with Section 29(6) of the Constitution of Swaziland, which guarantees the right to free primary education in public schools. Even though secondary school education is still not free, the government supports the vulnerable children by paying their fees through the OVC grant under the Deputy Prime Minister's portfolio. Where there have been challenges, the Government has acted swiftly in addressing same.

FPE was successfully rolled out from grades 1-2 in 2010, and it was extended to grade 7 in 2015. The enrolment rate has increased from 231 555 in 2009 to 239 422 in 2012 and 247 717 in 2015. Indicators suggest that Swaziland is on track in achieving universal access to primary education specified in Millennium Development Goal 2.

Achievement of access is but one aspect of the

progress, there is need to ensure that all children complete primary education. Completion rates at primary levels suggested that repetition and dropout may have still pushed some of the children out of the system. In 2006/2007 the completion rate was about 59.3 percent, it increased to 76.4 percent in 2012, suggesting that more children stayed on to complete primary education. This is an improvement, which implied that more children are being retained by the system.

5. PROMOTION OF GENDER EQUALITY AND EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN:

To illustrate the country's commitment towards gender equality, over and above the ratification of Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination AgainstWomen (CEDAW), the country has committed itself to a number of instruments to this effect.

These include the Protocol to the African Charter on Human and Peoples Rights on the Rights of Women in Africa. Additionally, the following measures have been undertaken:

- a) The Deeds Registry Act 37/1968 was amended in 2012 to give effect to the rights of women married in community of property to own land and have it registered in their own names.
- b) The Sexual Offenses and Domestic Violence Billhas been put in place and seeks to address all forms of sexual violence against women and children. The Government of Swaziland is investing all necessary efforts to accelerate enactment of the Billinto law. Since the last Parliament was dissolved in 2013 before it was promulgated into law, the Billitherefore lapsed and the process starts de novo.
- c) The common law rule that married women had no capacity to litigate without the assistance of their husbands was declared inconsistent with the constitutional right to equality by the High Court in the case of Sihlongonyane and others v Sihlongonyane decided in 2013.

The government has made significant strides in policy and legislative reform in addressing the challenges of gender based violence in the country evidenced by the approval of the National Gender Policy of 2010 and the enactment of People Trafficking and People Smuggling Act of 2012 Implementation of these legal frameworks included:

- Introduction of toll free lines;
- Establishment of the Domestic Violence and Victims support Centres in police stations; and
- Establishment of a One Stop Centreto provide care and support for gender based violence survivors.

6. RIGHTS OF REFUGEES

The Ministry of Home Affairs is responsible for protecting refugees and asylum seekers. The Ministry has a fully-fledged Refugees Department under its portfolio. The Department is designed to be a one stop shop for providing asylum seekers and refugee services, for example, status determination, voluntary repatriation and resettlement.

The Department also forms part of a tripartite team, which includes the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and a local NGO called Caritas, that co-ordinates refugee issues in Swaziland,

The Government of Swaziland through the Ministry has drafted and published the Refugees Bill No. 22 of 2015. The Bill provides for the recognition, protection, and control of refugees by giving effect (through domestication) to the 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees, the 1967 Protocol Relating to the Status of Refugees and the 1969 Convention Governing the Specific Aspects of Refugee Problems in Africa.

The Ministry operates and has recently upgraded

a refugee reception center. This center has a fully-fledged school and a clinic. In this center asylum seekers and refugees are also equipped with livelihood skills to sustain themselves while staying at the center and once they move out to integrate with society.

The clinic provides high quality health services to the refugees as well as the surrounding community. The Refugees Department also continues to keep an up to date electronic statistical data base for asylum seekers and refugees in the country.

Additionally, the Departments issues and renews status permits and convention travel documents to enable refugees to make frequent business trips to neighboring countries. Swaziland continues to host many Refugees from different countries.

7. FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION AND POLITICAL PARTICIPATION

Freedom of expression does exist in Swaziland, subject to the limitations as provided for by law.

Section 16 (read section 24) of the Constitution guarantees the right to freedom of expression including the right to a free media subject to respect for the dignity of others.

There are three privately owned print media companies which publish three titles between them.

The government and government owned companies advertise extensively in these privately owned media.

There is only one privately owned radio station and one privately owned television station. The radio and television stations with the widest reach are owned by the government. However, the government is liberalising the broadcast media space. To this end, the government enacted the Swaziland Communications Commission Act. The Act creates a communications commission which will license community and commercial radio and television stations

The Electoral Process with regard to participation of political parties is governed by Section 79 of the Constitution, which has been further interpreted by the Supreme Court Case of Sithole and Others vs. The Prime Minister and Others, decided in 2009. Although the case pronounced that political parties are not allowed to field candidates, members of such parties on individual merit can stand for elections. For example, in the current Parliament we have members of Political Parties who were elected to Parliament by individual merit.

8. FREEDOM OF ASSEMBLY

The Public Order Act, 1963 which currently regulates the organisation of peaceful assemblies is under review. The Government has drafted a new Public Order Amendment Bill which repeals the current Act. The Bill guarantees the freedom of peaceful assembly and expression. It also provides for amongst other things, notification and consultation in respect of public gatherings and the regulation of powers of the Police during public gatherings.

The Bill does away with the requirement that organisers of a public meeting or public gathering have to obtain a permit from the Police. Conveners of meetings or gatherings will have to give the Police at least seven days notice or in special circumstances not less than 48 hours where valid reasons are advanced on why the seven days' notice could not be given. The Bill has been tabled before Parliament. At the moment it is at the stage of public participation in that the public has been afforded an opportunity to comment on it.

The Government also amended the Industrial Relations Act, 2000 to allow for registration of workers and employer federations and thereby ensuring that workers and businesses enjoy freedom of association as provided for under ILO Convention No. 87 concerning freedom of association and the right to organise.

9. ACCESS TO JUSTICE AND RULE OF LAW

Since the last review, reasonable strides have been taken by the Government of the Kingdom of Swaziland towards addressing challenges within the Judiciary to enhance efficiency. A Legal Aid Policy has also been formulated with the help of UNDP. Furthermore a Legal Aid Bill has also been drafted and is yet to be tabled in Parliament for promulgation. This is an initiative by government aimed at improving access to justice for the indigent.

The Constitution of Swaziland guarantees the Independence of the Judiciary. The Government of Swaziland respects and upholds the independence of the Judiciary. The Government does not interfere with judicial officers in the discharge of their judicial functions. The Government is committed to giving the judiciary adequate resources to enable it to fulfill its constitutional mandate.

Candidates selected for judicial office are persons

of high moral character and integrity and must have practiced law for 10 years in the case of the High Court and 15 years for Supreme Court Judges. The tenure of judges is secure. Judges hold office until the age of 75. Judges may only be removed from office for serious misbehavior or incapacity established after an independent inquiry at which the judge has legal representation.

In an attempt to address the backlog of cases in our courts, the Judiciary recruited 4 additional High Court Judges in 2015 to further enhance efficiency in the judicial system and subsequently improve access to justice. These positions were advertised in the media and the process was transparent. The move is aimed at addressing the challenges that the judicial system faced. Also in addressing the challenges, continued legal training for the judicial officers is much needed and will be appreciated.

10. ACCESS TO CLEAN POTABLE WATER AND ELECTRIFICATION

The country is committed to ensure the protection and promotion of the rights to access potable water and sanitation.

The country has made substantial progress in accessing safe drinking water by the population. The proportion of people with access to safe drinking water has increased by 16% from 56.4 percent in 1997 to 72.4 percent in 2014 at national level. The improvement is observed in both the rural and urban areas. In 2014, 63.4 percent of the rural population had access to improved water sources compared to 95.8 percent for urban areas. As of 2014, the proportion of the population estimated to have access to electricity is 65 percent. Urban and rural households had electricity access of 83.8 percent and 53.8 percent, respectively.

11. THE SUPPRESSION OF TERRORISM ACT

The government has drafted the Suppression of Terrorism (Amendment) Bill, 2013. The purpose of the Bill is to amend the definition of 'terrorist act' and to provide for incidental matters.

The intention behind the amendments of the two pieces of legislation is to bring them in line with the Constitution of Swaziland and the country's international human rights obligations. To this end the Government received technical assistance in drafting the amendment Bill from the International Labour Organisation.

A key feature of the Amendment Bill is its curtailing of the wide definition of 'terrorist act'. Section 2(j) has been amended by removing the word 'involves', which, in its existing form allows elasticity when assessing whether conduct and activities constitutes terrorists acts. The proposed amendment to the exiting definition will ensure that the provision is not unduly stretched to cover activities which are not otherwise terrorist acts.

The Amendment therefore seeks to direct the interpreter to establish whether a particular act prejudices national security or public safety, and thereby be termed a terrorist act. The decision of a Minister to proscribe an entity can now be subjected to judicial review.

The Suppression of Terrorism Amendment Bill gives effect to resolutions of the United Nations Security Council relating to the fight against terrorism. In this regard, section 11(b) of the existing legislation has been amended by giving effect to UN resolution 2178.

The Bill was tabled before Parliament under a certificate of urgency. The Legislature has invited the public for comments on the content of the Bill. Already, a significant number of civil society organisations and individuals havealready registered to submit to the Parliamentary Portfolio Committee.

12. ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE

The Swaziland Government has continued to formulate and implement initiatives aimed at improving the health of everyone in the country. These include:

The HIV and AIDS Programme: As part of improving prevention of HIV, there has been an increase in the number of people accessing Anti-Retroviral Therapy (ART) due to the introduction of immediate access to ART, treatment for pregnant and breastfeeding mothers in the country. This is aimed at further reducing transmission of infections among people in the country.

There has been a drastic scale-up of ART by the Ministry of Health (MoH). By the end of 2014, a total of 125,421 people were on ART, with 7,906 (six percent) being children under 14 years. With an increase in the number of people on ART, a key priority for the MoH is to ensure that those on ART stay alive. In this regard it is pleasing to note that ART retention for adults and children at 36 months is 78 percent and 83 percent respectively.

The percentage of HIV infected infants born to HIV positive mothers has continued to decrease from 16.4 percent in 2011 to 9.17 in 2014 with a target of reaching five percent by 2018. This is as a result of increased coverage on ART for pregnant and breastfeeding mothers. The Ministry is progressively rolling out early ART initiation for all pregnant and breastfeeding mothers who are HIV positive where they receive ART as soon as possible regardless of their CD4 count. ART is known to have a preventative effect on transmission of HIV.

There has been an increase in the proportion of children having access to HIV testing as early as 6 weeks, and the coverage has reached 81 percent. More than 80 percent of public facilities are now able to collect blood for early infant diagnosis of HIV. Early infant diagnosis of HIV has ensured that more children in need of ART are provided with ART, as a step towards Universal coverage for Children on ART by 2018. The Government remains committed to financing the procurement of antiretroviral drugs, catering for approximately 90 percent of the budget.

The Malaria Prevention Programme: Swaziland continues to do well in response to malaria with the country being recognized for its leadership and efforts in malaria response by the African Union Certification of Malaria Elimination by 2018. A strategic plan 2015-2020 has been developed to guide the country after achieving malaria elimination in 2015 up until WHO certification in 2018 and beyond.

Both the incidence and deaths rates of malaria in the country have significantly dropped as the country draws closer to elimination. The success could be attributed to:

- The strengthened health facility mentoring and monitoring visits by the programme, to ensure adherence to the National Diagnosis and Treatment guidelines by health care workers.
- The strong management and resource mobilisation mechanism, which has enabled theprogramme to secure resources up to 2018.
- The introduction of active case surveillance of all confirmed cases by the programme. Cases are followed up immediately after confirmation before possibilities of onward transmission.
- The consistent Indoor Residual Spraying coverage of above 90 percent annually.

13. CONCLUSION

The Government of the Kingdom of Swaziland continues to be committed to its obligations under international human rights Conventions and Treaties. The Government appreciates that human rights are constantly evolving and is thus dedicated to ensuring that the human rights of its people are respected, protected and enforced.

However, the shortage of personnel and financial resources hinders the compilation and analysis of data to produce requisite State Party reports and acknowledges the need for technical assistance in this regard.

We look forward to an interactive and fruitful dialogue. I thank you.

ON pages 14 and 15 we have published the entire report by Justice and Constitutional Affairs Minister Edgar Hillary which he presented on Monday in Geneva to the United Nations Human Rights Working Group.

With a shadow group of civil society groups having been to Geneva to present their own a month ago, the country's official Universal Periodical Review (UPR) report was expected with keen interests from both local and international parties.

Those who painted a certain image of the country are now denouncing his report as only lies. We know why they say that -Hillary's report did a lot of damage to their prospective donors who expected government to confirm the calamity that is said to be existing in the country.

Hillary's report was not aimed at shooting anything down, but presenting the true picture as it obtains on the ground.

One of the key issues, given that this is a human rights meeting, government was expected to explain, relates to freedom of association and assembly.

I would want to refer to what Hillary reported to the Geneva conference on Monday and quote him verbatim: "The Public Order Act, 1963 which currently regulates the organisation of peaceful assemblies is under review. The government has drafted a new Public Order Amendment Bill, which repeals the current Act.

Guarantees

mean well for the country, that is what we need to do.

Engaging in debates for the sake of justifying some funding will not help us, what we need is to quickly move on if we agree on a position.

As the Bill is still before Parliament, in committee stage, government had not explained its position on it until the UPR report, which came before the Bill is passed.

When the bill is put before the House for debate and adoption, it will be explained and we hope this position will not change.



OUT of all the cities in the country Mbabane is at the centre of a controversy regarding its management of the affairs of the city and its workers to the effect the municipality has been given numbered days to clean its corridors, instead the mayor is opting to cut out the media.

This is typical of someone on an agenda to hide some skeleton the ratepayer and taxpayer would rather not know about otherwise there is no reason to hide information from the media if that information is in the public interest as in all operations of a municipality.

This is not a private farm but a state funded institution and a local government answerable to voters, taxpayers and ratepayers and not private profit, at least that is the main dividend accruing to the owners of the facility.

Is the Mbabane municipality in private practice to protect its product against competition or is it more about service delivery?

After all it was not until the issues got to the public domain where they belong that the shady dealings of council began being addressed.

Worried

If it was for anything the mayor may as well be worried about influencing the processes of media reporting of the activities of municipalities at all front in order to guarantee transparency, not to need the media when he wants to market egos such as reelection by peers.

In his renewed mandate to continue operating in darkness, Benito Jones rode on a newspaper report about Gugulethu Hlophe's replacement to fire a diatribe at councillors who have the wisdom and courage to leak information to the media about the shortcomings of council.

Were it not for these honourable councilors, if they were the sources of the yital information that is the Mbabane Council management would still be bulldozing its way into forcing down the throat of workers its retrenchment programmes.

However when the sources within council came to the media and to parliament, the Mbabane municipality headed by Jones, was stopped right on its claws. All along we had been fed

colourful research papers with



exotic theories that have no regard for service delivery as the cornerstone for local governance. This delay developed into a protracted war between council and its employees much to the detriment of ratepayer and taxpayer in the form of compromised service delivery, look everywhere around Mbabane for evidence.

We have all along known that council management has the business of diverting municipality funds into entertainment and travelling expeditions for councilors in order for these not to play the role of watchdog in the interests of those who voted them into office and also to look into the interests of the state. As a result Mbabane municipal council has, for many years, become the big brother from which the other municipalities were forced to template urbane governance standards.

The Mbabane mayor would rather not have the media discuss how council deliberates on such issues as the abattoir that is rotting away yet the taxpayer spent fortunes on it, the farmers from around the country are without a government facility of this quality and therefore are forced to slaughter their animals together with stock thieves in the forest before sending the meat for sale in the city butcheries with the municipality inspectors looking the other way.

Manzini followed from the footsteps of big brother Mbabane by closing down its own abattoir, this smacks of a complicity to play dirty, most likely to provide business to certain preferred entities or individuals.

This is a service that must be provided to the people of Mbabane and Manzini and not profit-making undertakings, however the mayor would rather not have the media follow up on these issues.

Record

Check the record of performance at the Mabuya municipality in Ngwenya where some board members are having a free for all on tendering and sunshine holiday making in South Africa last

winter, courtesy of the non-interference of the ministry of housing and urban development. Go further east into the Vuvulane municipality find out where there is anything urban governance there save for sugarcane wars. For many years cows in Nhlangano were first to familiarize with traffic lights, they got so familiar with the streets that they walked when the lights turned green, much like the Manzini rate-paying cows in Ngwane Park that even pick leftovers from the rubbish bins.

Numerous

There were those numerous commissions of enquiry complete with recommendations that were supposed to be implemented by the council but to this very day they have not been, why, the reasons could be with the fact that councilors cannot implement recommendations that may anger the person who signs the cheque for their sitting, travel, breakfast meetings, conferences, press briefing allowances, church service allowances etc. Once they become vocal they are most likely to be labeled the black sheep such as the poor blighter Nganono who, according to council, now stinks worse than the dump site in Mahwalala and must return there where he originated from, he's not council material.

When water shedding hit Mbabane the mayor was there clad in his robes and looking majestic as ever dangling a bucket queuing for water. He was passing through the old bus rank with his nostrils sandwiched between the index finger and the thumb due to the stench. This also is the same mayor who drives on the wrong side of the road as he doges potholes around the capital.

He is the same person who warns his daughters against straying to as far as the SASCO building, let alone going shopping at the Mall during a downpour.

Researcher Richard Stren in 2008 concluded that in cities where mayors have influence, the way in which the mayor views

low-income groups and their organizations, the settlements in which they live and the work in which they engage is important Mayors often view the poor and their settlements and incomeearning activities as "the problem", even as the city economy depends on them. In many cities such as Mbabane and Manzini. there is a strong middle class that uses democratic processes to push city and municipal governments towards policies that are anti-poor, anti-vendors, antistreet, anti-pedestrian and antimixed land use. Many mayors dream of transforming "their city" into a "world class city". In doing so, they often look to successful cities that they have visited or read about - such as Fort Worth for Mbabane and Mufurira for Manzini.

Mayors often want to support mega-projects that will be their "legacy" (and, they hope, get them re-elected or shifted to other political positions), with little concern for the evictions and displacements that these mega-projects can bring.

They quite often achieve this by osculating with the city managers.

Stren argues that Singapore has long served as an example that captures the imagination of politicians and developers. But this is without any recognition of what has actually underpinned its success - one of the fastest growing economies in the world over a long period, a very small population with almost no rural population and thus no rapid rural-urban migration boosting the city's population growth, and much of the land in public ownership.

Manzini, for instance, is facing an uphill with the ever growing populations of Mpholi, Makholweni, Murray Camps, Sicelwini, Khoza, Mhobodleni, kaShali, Sidzakeni, Ticancweni, Masekweni all competing for the services that the city has designed for what it has all along perceived to be the ideal Manzini popula-

Similarly Mbabane must find ways of dealing with Mpolonjeni. Mangwaneni, Sitibeni, Bahai,

How to wean yourself off sugar

In the first part of this exclusive extract, I discussed how to ascertain whether you have a problem with sugar - in particular during times of stress.

Today, we will look at how you can wean yourself off the white stuff for good.

In my clinic, people often say they will never be able to give up

However, you'd be surprised how quickly your taste buds change and how you come to appreciate the sweetness of other foods such as roasted sweet potatoes and carrots.

I would suggest that you have a good spring clean of your food cupboards and discard anything containing sugar.

It's tempting to give away food if the sell by date is fine but do you really want to encourage anyone else to eat sugar? Bin it.

When I started out in the nutrition field over 30 years ago, it was much harder for people as there simply weren't the choices there are now.

Nowadays if, say, you don't have time to make your own salad dressing, there will usually be an alternative in the shops that you can use, avoiding ones with high levels of sugar and sweeteners. The same goes for spaghetti sauces and mayonnaise.

It is just a question of getting used to buying different brands. You may find that your local health food shop will stock some alternatives for foods that you regularly buy that are sugar-free (with no artificial sweeteners added) and that will taste quite

I have included some sugar-free recipes in this book. I have also included some savoury ones as you may be surprised to find just how much sugar is in the savoury foods you eat.

Mainly, I want to show you that you can have sweet foods that are not laden with an ingredient that is full of calories and has no nutritional value.

EAT LITTLE AND OFTEN

To keep your blood sugar balanced and to avoid the dips (low blood sugar, hypoglycaemia) that will send you racing off to get a quick fix with a chocolate bar or a packet of biscuits, make sure that you are eating little and


My recommendation is have a good breakfast, lunch and dinner and also to include a mid-morning and a mid-afternoon snack.

Remember that breakfast means 'breaking the fast'.

You have not eaten since dinner the night before and that first meal of the day is the one that breaks the fast.

Of course it needs to be a good breakfast and so I have given suggestions. If you opt for a sugary breakfast cereal, this will give a quick rise in blood sugar followed by a drop soon afterwards, giving you the feeling that you need something else, another quick fix to keep you going and so it goes on.

Having caffeine can also make you crave sugar so it would be better to limit caffeine in order to make it easier to stop the sugar.

WEANING YOURSELF OFF SUGAR

I would suggest you follow these simple steps to make coming off sugar easier.

You could take these steps one week at a time or a day at a time. It really depends on your personIt is a bit like someone giving up smoking, some people would rather just stop; others gradually reduce. The choice is yours.

First of all, take out of your diet all the savoury foods that contain added sugar.

This might be as simple as just changing the brand so you keep the same food but the ingredients are healthier.

Or you might have to ditch that food, if there isn't an alternate, or make it yourself.

Foods to think about are tomato (spaghetti) sauces, mayonnaise, salad dressings, baked beans and

So, for example, a shop-bought sweet chilli sauce has sugar as the first ingredient.

I would suggest that, if you still want to use this kind of sauce, to make it yourself and add a little pure maple syrup to give that sweet taste.

OTHER THINGS THAT LEAD TO EATING SUGAR

Are you stressed?

· Are you eating without think-

 Are you thirsty rather than hungry?

The next step is to stop adding sugar to your hot drinks and other foods.

Some people will sprinkle sugar on to their cereal in the morning when there is already a lot of sugar added to it (remember, read those packets).

This is similar to people who sprinkle salt on their food before tasting it, when it might be salty enough.

Wean yourself off added sugar, gradually diminishing the amount you use each day over a period of days or maybe weeks.

Next, have a look at the sweet foods you are eating on a regular basis that contain added or hid-

You might think fruit yogurt that says 'live' on the tub is healthy but bear in mind, as we have seen, that it can contain up to eight teaspoons of sugar. Buy natural organic yogurt and drop in or blend in your own fruit, fresh or frozen. Daily Mail

SWAZILAND BANS IMPORT OF R141B

programme funded by Montreal Protocol to the tune of E7 million

MINISTER of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Jabulani Mabuza has called for the ban of R141b, a hydro fluorocarbon (HCFC) ozone depleting substance.

This follows 50 percent decrease in the consumption of ODS through retrofitting of the refrigeration industry facilitated by the Montreal Protocol multilateral funding amounting to over E7 million.

The minister said this was a kind gesture, which afforded the kingdom with the opportunity to accelerate phasing out of the HCFCs.

"The country is party to the Montreal Protocol which international instrument has been put in place to curb the use of substances that deplete the ozone layer," he said.

"This is a follow up to another successful intervention facilitated through the Swaziland Environment Authority on the phasing out of the R122 a CFC also used in the air-conditioning and refrigeration sector," he added.

The minister said he looked forward to the Swaziland

Environment Authority (SEA)'s efforts to regulate consumption of ODS in the country strengthened, including provision of licensing system given that the biggest consumer of the HCFC in the refrigeration industry has received such assistance with support from UNDP and UNEP to halt the importation of such substances into the country.

Meanwhile, United Nations
Development Programme
(UNDP) Deputy Resident
Representative Kabiru Nasidi
said the Public Partnership Policy

(PPP) adopted by Swaziland in 2013 had created more than 700 jobs.

Benefits

"The benefits that came with this intervention contributed immensely to the creation of much needed jobs in the country," he said.

He further commended the country's efforts as it joied the global community in the endorsement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), Agenda 2030.

"The linkages between sustain-

able development and industrial actions that a country undertakes remains key in defining the contribution the country makes to global impacts and advance," he said.

Nasidi pointed out that of the 17 SDGs, two were key, SDG 12 on ensuring sustainable consumption and production patterns, and SDG 13 on Climate Action, but more importantly how these contribute to the foundation of SDGs, poverty alleviation improvement of the lives of the people.

Energy ministry finalising IPP policy

MINISTER of Natural Resources and Energy Jabulile Mashwama says the ministry is finalising the Independent Power Producer Policy which will ensure there are clear guidelines for independent power producers.

She said this was critical because while electricity producers expected a fair return for their investments, consumers were looking for access to electricity, reliable quality of supply and services at competitive prices.

"The regulator's role therefore is to work towards balancing these respective needs," she said

Mashwama was speaking during the introduction of the Swaziland Energy Regulatory Authority (SERA) board of directors on Tuesday.

She said she was proud the SERA have already licensed

IPPs, one of which was already generating solar energy at Siteki. Mashwama was referring to Wunder Sight Investments (Pty) Ltd whose photovoltaic plant was switched on in March 2016.

"Swaziland should reach the stage of meeting her own electricity demand and exporting the excess to the region which also currently has a deficit in electricity supply," she said. The minister said it was encouraging that SERA has a strategic plan in place and has developed some of the key regulatory instruments such as the tariff methodology, grid code, and licensing by-laws which gave clear guidelines and technical standards critical for the development of the electricity sector.

Mashwama applauded SERA for successfully hosting the

Regional Electricity Regulators Association of Southern Africa (RERA) annual general meeting and conference for the first time in 2015. She said the event was well organised with pertinent topics discussed, with professionalism displayed in all the conference activities, including the exhibitions.

"Swaziland is currently a net importer of electricity and to attain vision 2022, of the first world status, government is looking up to SERA to put in place prudent regulatory mechanisms to develop the electricity sector," said Mashwama.

SERA also landed an executive seat as chairperson of the portfolio committee on capacity building and information sharing of RERA.

The new seat placed the regulator in a key strategic decision making position in taking RERA to the next level through planning and organising activities.

REDUCTION CAN CURB TAX AVOIDAN

THE planned reduction of corporate tax by government can result in the lowering of tax avoidance and tax evasion.

University of Swaziland (UNISWA) Corporate Finance and Taxation lecturer, Kennedy Hlatini, said academic literature had observed that environments of low corporate taxation rates were generally characterised by low incidence of tax avoidance and tax evasion.

Tax avoidance is the use of legal measures to use the tax regime to find ways to pay the lowest rate of tax, for instance, giving assets to your children before you die to avoid paying inheritance tax.

Tax evasion, on the other hand, is taking illegal steps to avoid paying tax, like not declaring income to the taxman.

Success

Hlatini said the success of the planned reduction of corporate tax by 15 percent over the next four years would depend on the feasibility study conducted by government.

However, he said taxation was the main source of revenue for any country and a reduction in a tax rate could result in lower revenue for the coun-

"The reduction of income due to lower tax receipts could be offset by the inflows of foreign direct investment," said Hlatini.

He said companies, capital and labour were naturally drawn to countries that have low tax rates, as lower tax rates could result in higher profits, rates of return, and salaries.

Reduction

A sizable reduction in corporate tax could result in the country becoming a tax haven.

"Thus the drop in tax revenue as a result of the fall in tax receipts as a result of a corporate tax rate reduction, could be offset by an increase of the value of tax receipts received, which could be more than the current levels," he said.

Swaziland has announced a new

strategy which it hopes will attract more foreign investors to the country by reducing company taxes by 15 percent.

Intention

This will be carried out over a four-year period with the intention of further reducing such taxes to levels conducive to the growth of businesses in the country especially those originating from abroad.

Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini said corporate tax would remain the same at least for now.

"The adjustment in corporate tax was made in 2014 and there have been no adjustment to corporate tax since then," he said.

"Specific factors negatively affecting kombi crew members include poor working environment, uncompetitive pay, crew members' jobs not being respected by outsiders, supervisor too busy and not available for workers, heavy work load, too long working hours and lack of days off, lack of promotion, stress and inequitable rewards," he said.

Addressing these issues was critical as the eighth United Nations (UN)

sustainable development goals encouraged promotion of inclusive and sustainable economic growth, full and productive employment and decent work for all solv

Bimha said transport entrepreneurs needed more consistent approaches to dealing with attitudes and job satisfaction challenges among kombi crew members to remain profitable.

Meanwhile, he said formal and regular attitude surveys needed to be frequently conducted to help management to use these facts to develop their businesses.

"Regular surveys will show trends over time and may facilitate comparison across industries and countries for benchmarking purposes," he said. A team of experts had been tasked with studying the root cause of the recurrent challenges in recording personal import data between Swaziland and South Africa.

The team comprised of representatives from the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA), ministry of finance, economic planning and development, commerce, industry and trade, and the South African Revenue Services (SARS), national treasury of South Africa, and the Southern Africans Customs Union (SACU) secretariat.

According to a statement released by SACU, the objective of the meeting was to establish the root cause and find an amicable solution to the recurrent challenges detected in the actual trade data reconciliation process between South Africa and Swaziland.

The task team undertook field visits intended to specify how personal imports should be recorded in trade statistics.

SACU said in February, 2016 the team visited the Ngwenya/Oshoek Border Post, which was considered the biggest commercial border accounting for about 60 per cent of imports into Swaziland.

The border records about 90 000 travellers passing through on a monthly basis, issup of ear

Another border post visited was Nsalitje/Onverwatcht, a non commercial designated site allocated 250 kilometres from the Ngwenya/Oshoek Border Post.

"One of the recurrent challenges identified between the two countries is the variance in data for Chapter 99 that entails personal effects and private shoppers. This constitute a significant weight relative to the overall Swaziland imports, hence the need to thoroughly study the main cause of the problem in data generating process," said SACU.

A report on the findings from the field visits was presented at the meeting of the Task Team on Trade Data Reconciliation held on March 16-17, 2016 in Johannesburg, South Africa.

"As provided for in the 2002 SACU agreement, member states are required to submit actual data of intra-SACU trade for the recent financial year to the Secretariat at least six months prior to the beginning of any financial year," said SACU.

However, before this data could be used for revenue sharing purposes it was a requirement that the data sets must be reconciled among the member states to uphold the integrity and quality of the data.

The data reconciliation process normally starts in May and would end in September every year.

How Mozambique can contain its debt crisis, avoid long-term damage

MAPUTO - Mozambique's return to the international limelight reads like a John le Carré novel.

The elements of a bestseller are all present: growing internal instability, unexplored natural gas deposits, international loans to purchase weapons disguised as lending to fund tuna boats, and hidden public loan guarantees to private companies owned by the secret services. And, of course, there are legions of international bankers and diplomats wringing hands in latenight meetings.

Unfortunately, this is not fiction. The debts are real and the costs of these decisions will hang over Mozambique for decades. This artile provides a summary of what we now about Mozambique's external debt situation and proposes measures to contain the current situation, and avoid longer-term dam-

'e scale of the debt burden

A r weeks of rumour, some larity about Mozambique's external debt position recently emerged following an emergency visit of the government to the International Monetary Fund in Washington. In the table below, I pull together some rough estimates based on the latest information calculations.


The country's officially reported external debt stock at the end 2014 was more than US\$6.5 billion, excluding \$500 million taken on to government accounts in 2014 associated with the infamous Ematum deal for the tuna fleet.

Even before the current crisis, this was a cause for concern.

Mozambique had been a major beneficiary of various debt relief initiatives in the late 1990s and 2000s. At the beginning of this century, the country's debt stock was about \$1 billion. In 2010 the same stock was \$3.3 billion. By 2014 it had doubled.

Then there's what is owed on the controversial "new" debts:

- Ematum, for the controversial tuna fleet;
- ProIndicus, which is aimed at providing security, especially for gas and oil operations; and
- Mozambique Asset
 Management, which was set up for

maritime maintenance and repairs. Due to the heavy financial burden of the Ematum deal, originally due in 2020, it was recently restructured. The repayment period was extended from 2020 to 2023, increasing the annual interest rate from 6.305% to 10.5%, and switching to a "bullet" repayment. This means that the full principal amount is only repaid at the end of the period.

Repaid

The two other loans, ProIndicus and Mozambique Asset Management, are standard private loans and must be repaid in the next five years.

Together, the immediate annual costs of these three debts are expected to be more than \$300 million per year, double the total external debt service costs in 2014.

Another point that has been neglected in the debate around these three controversial loans is additional public debt taken on since 2014. According to government declarations, the external debt stock stood at \$9.89 billion in May 2016. Basic arithmetic means that, even excluding the controversial loans, a further \$1.4 billion of public external debt has been incurred since 2014. This continues a worrying trend of rapid indebtedness.

What it all adds up to

Putting all this together, annual debt service costs are likely to be in the region of \$500 million over the next few years, of which more than \$200 million are in interest costs alone. These costs could be higher, depending on the structure of these other more recent debts.

A total of \$500 million is equivalent to about 33% of conventional merchandise exports – excluding the contribution of mega-projects such as aluminum and coal – or 25% of net international reserves. **Reviewing**

This will create significant pressures on public finances.

Moreover, news that a set of major donors, including the International Monetary Fund and World Bank, are reviewing their lending to Mozambique means that access to hard currency will become even more scarce in the short term. Further depreciation of the currency is likely, which would only add to the local currency cost of the debt burden.

What action can be taken How can Mozambique contain this situation and avoid a downward spiral?

There are no simple solutions.

But calls by donors for full transparency and accountability around

the debt situation must be taken more seriously. The government could start by opening its books to a credible and thorough external audit of the external debt, as well as of its relationships with private companies through loan guarantees and private-public partnerships.

Admittedly, a legal investigation into the controversial loans has begun. This is welcome but needs to be more than a pro forma exercise and must be free from political interference.

Substantive actions in these two domains would go some way to restoring donor confidence.

A further set of immediate actions should be to deal with the companies associated with the controversial loans. Under current circumstances, it is difficult to envisage any plausible scenario under which these companies become viable. A sensible option is to avoid further losses now.

One strategy here starts by recognising that some of the rights owned by these companies are valuable, as are the existing assets of Ematum. An international auction to these rights or to an exclusive management contract would serve two purposes. First, it would raise money to pay off the loans, thereby reducing their social costs.

Second, it would provide a transparent commercial valuation of the businesses opening the way for renegotiation with creditors.

In my view, if the private lenders to ProIndicus and Mozambique Asset Management were excessively optimistic in their valuation of these businesses, they should bear some losses.

Temptations to be avoided

An unavoidable consequence of the current crisis will be some form of austerity. Here the government needs to maintain a cool head and avoid rash decisions that undermine long-term growth and fiscal health. It will be tempting to seek a new round of loans from abroad, perhaps from China where Mozambican President Filipe Nyusi will be making an official visit this month.

Of course, some short-run relief would be handy. But there is a major risk that this is not transparent and will incur new fiscal liabilities or high long-run opportunity costs. Moreover, this approach could alienate other donors and therefore jeopardise critical sources of financing for social sectors.

The general point is a more serious and rational approach to public debt is needed, in which loan decisions based on vanity or political preferences are avoided. Rather, rigorous analysis of project viability and the profile of their net benefits is needed. It would be helpful to enact in law stricter requirements and transparency around all new debt issues and guarantees.

Another temptation is to hand out attractive tax breaks to foreign companies to kick-start delayed natural resource investments.

Again, this might provide temporary relief but this would be the public finance equivalent of selling the family silver to a pawn shop. It is critical that the long-run public value of these assets is not squandered due to poor policy decisions by a previous government.

Finally, it is essential that the government continues to invest in the foundations for sustained growth. This means that public investment in infrastructure, agricultural development and human capital (education, health) should be the main priorities.

So these budgets need to be ringfenced in some way. This is easier said than done, especially give ongoing internal conflict. Solving this political standoff is vital to get out of the current economic mess. The conversation

Banks shun government efforts to discuss Guptas

JOHANNESBURG - FirstRand [JSE:FSR] and Barclays Africa Group [BGA] rebuffed efforts from government ministers to discuss the closure of bank accounts related to companies controlled by the Gupta family, accused by critics of using their friendship with President Jacob Zuma to exert influence over political appointments.

Barclays Africa's Absa unit
"respectfully declined" an offer to
meet Mines Minister Mosebenzi
Zwane over the issue, the

Johannesburg-based lender said in an emailed response to questions on Wednesday. "As a bank we cannot discuss any past, present or prospective clients in such forums."

South Africa last month established a team that also includes Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan and Labour Minister Mildred Oliphant to contact banks that had dropped the Gupta's Oakbay Investments [JSE:ORL]as clients. FirstRand's First National Bank, Standard Bank Group [JSE:SBK] and Nedbank Group [JSE:NED] said last month they would shut the company's accounts. Oakbay Chief Executive Officer Nazeem Howa said the steps are unprecedented, threaten 7 500 jobs and come even though no wrongdoing has been proved against the company of Guttas.

"FirstRand has not met with any government delegation on the Oakbay issue," Sam Moss, spokesperson for the Johannesburg-based lender, said in an emailed response to questions.

Questions over the Guptas' influ-

stepped forward with allegations that the wealthy Indian family offered them cabinet posts in exchange for business concessions. That spurred a probe by the party and another by the public protector. The Guptas deny any wrongdoing. Zuma has said only he has the authority to appoint ministers. Zim govt loses millions to graft

HARARE - Government is suffering financial losses running into millions of dollars annually owing to rampant corruption in its systems, a 2015 Civil Service audit report has revealed.

This comes amid reports that seven officers from the Civil Service Commission have been suspended for their role in a well-knit recruitment scandal.

Nancy Chinyoka, Venagi Dembure, Munyaradzi Marume, Joseph Ziera, Patrick Jachi, Bright Tembo and Tonderai Chizhande are now facing criminal charges and their cases are before the courts.

In the report that was availed to the media by the CSC on Wednesday, some people are literally employed to do nothing in some state entities.

A case in point is the deployment of 121 agricultural extension workers in urban areas where there are no posts for their work.

However, a recommendation has since been made that the workers be deployed to rural areas where their services are needed.

Another case of profligacy highlighted in the report is the payment of unsanctioned overtime allowances by the Central Vehicle Registry. It was noted that there was an abuse of accounting officer's post for instance, in the ministry of transport and infrastructure development where systems were arm twisted to pay bonuses for contract workers.

Buhari won't demand apology

LONDON - Nigeria's president says he won't demand an apology after British Prime Minister David Cameron called his country one of the world's most corrupt

Cameron was hosting an international anticorruption summit in London yesterday. At a Buckingham Palace reception, a television microphone caught Cameron saying the "leaders of some fantastically corrupt countries" were coming. Cameron referred to "Nigeria and Afghanistan - possibly two of the most corrupt countries in the world".

Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari, who is due to attend, said on Wednesday that "I am not going to demand any apology from anybody."

Speaking at an anti-corruption meeting ahead of the summit, Buhari says he wanted the return of plundered Nigerian assets held in British

What would I do with an apology? I need something tangible," Buhari said.

He described corruption as "a hydra-headed monster and a canker that undermines the fabric of all societies. It does not differentiate between developed and developing countries."

'Kabila can remain in office without a vote'

LUBUMBASHI - DR Congo's President Joseph Kabila can remain in office when his mandate expires at the end of 2016, even without being re-elected, the Constitutional Court said.

The ruling came amid rising tensions over the government's failure to set a date for the country's next elections, originally due in November this year before Kabila's mandate ends.

After months of incessant controversy, protests and arrests, Wednesday saw police in Lubumbashi, the country's second biggest city, use tear gas and stun batons to clear thousands of opposition supporters who had stormed a courthouse.

The protesters forced their way inside in support of powerful opposition figure Moise Katumbi, a wealthy former governor of mineral-rich Katanga province who is Kabila's leading rival.

He was appearing in court

for the second time this month over alleged use of foreign mercenaries, including Americans, allegations he has slammed as "å grotesque lie" and "a machination".

Wednesday's constitutional ruling in Kinshasa followed a request for clarification by the ruling party over Kabila's fate should the polls fail to be held on schedule, as is widely expected.

Kabila, who took over Democratic Republic of Congo on his father's assassination in 2001, is constitutionally barred from running for a third term. He won successive elections in 2006 and 2011.

The nine-member Constitutional Court — three of them chosen by Kabila, three by parliament - based its response on article 70 of the constitution stating that a president remains in office until the next head of state steps in.

The opposition on the other hand argued in favour of article 75 calling for the Senate president to step in pending new elections.

Kabila has been under pressure from the international community to stick to the election schedule, while the opposition suspects he is planning to amend the constitution to extend his rule. In Lubumbashi, the 51-year-old flamboyant Katumbi entered the court for a closed-door hearing sporting an all-white outfit and a scarf in the colours of the national flag. News24



4 cops killed in south Tunisia

TUNIS - A jihadist militant detonated his explosives belt, killing four policemen during a raid by security forces in southern Tunisia, the interior ministry said. It said a firefight erupted between militants in the Tatouine governorate and a national guard unit acting on information from an "anti-terrorist" operation earlier the same day near Tunis. "One terrorist element was shot dead while the other detonated his explosives belt, killing two officers and two agents of the national guard," it said. Afp

Nigeria bank chiefs quizzed

LAGOS - Nigeria's central bank on Wednesday said it was investigating some banks in connection with slush funds allegedly set up by a former oil minister to rig last year's elections. The Central Bank of Nigeria said it was "fully aware and indeed a part of the ongoing investigation of certain financial transactions in some banks by law enforcement authorities." It was conducting its own "special examinations and investigations" into the claims, as well as who may be involved, vowing not to allow the banking system to be used for fraud. Afp

Egypt court recommends death for 25 over tribal clash

CAIRO - An Egyptian court recommended death sentences for 25 people over deadly tribal clashes in 2014 in the southern province of Aswan, judicial and prosecution officials said. The court asked the mufti - the country's official

interpreter of Islamic law to consider the death sentences and it scheduled a session to pronounce its final decision on June 7.The 25 defendants were among



163 people accused of killing 28 people in clashes between two tribes in Aswan that erupted after a woman was accosted in April 2014. Reuters

Kenya allocates \$10m to refugee camp

NAIROBI - Kenya said it had set aside \$10million (R150-million) to help fund the closing of the world's largest refugee camp, home to about 350 000 mostly Somali refugees, citing security fears. Kenya hosts about 600 000 refugees, some of whom have lived in the country for a quarter of a century. Last Friday, an interior ministry official announced a plan to refuse new refugee arrivals and shut Dadaab on the Kenya-Somalia border. Reuters

Rapist sentenced to 28 years

DURBAN - A 28-old-man was sentenced to 10 years in jail for rape and 18 years for two counts of robbery by the Empangeni Regional Court, KwaZulu-Natal police said yesterday. Last year, he raped a 40-year-old woman while she was asleep with her children, and stole two cellphones, Major Shooz Magudulela said. He was sentenced on Tuesday, KwaZulu-Natal Police Commissioner, Lieutenant General Mmamonnye Ngobeni, hoped the sentence would deter other criminals. News24

JOHANNEBSURG - The Patriotic Alliance (PA) came to attention towards the end of 2013 in the Western Cape ahead of the 2014 national and provincial elections and was characterised by its work with gang members there amid their conflict over turf.

SA law firm linked over 400 times in Papers

BLOEMFONTEIN - Phatshoane Henney Attorneys, a Bloemfontein based law firm, has been linked to more than 400 entities in the Panama Papers.

A searchable database of the leaked documents, which is hosted by The International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ), showed that Phatshoane Henney Attorneys has acted as an intermediary for 436 entities.

The firm told News24 in an e-mailed statement that all of their clients' investments in foreign companies "are in accordance with the applicable exchange control regulations which also require tax clearance certificates".

"Taxes are therefore paid, both in SA and abroad, as and when applicable in terms of the relevant tax legislation," said CEO, Jan

"We have always and are still advising clients investing significant amounts abroad, not to do so in their personal names in order to avoid various onerous administrative and cost consequences, especially in the event of death," he said.

He said Phatshoane Henney Attorneys are a "leading firm in the field of estate planning and administration and it is therefore expected that we will also have a sizeable number of clients investing abroad".

Phatshoane Henney Attorneys also defended its relationship with Mossack Fonseca, the firm that the 11.5 million confidential documents were leaked from. The leaked documents purport to show how clients hid billions in tax havens. News24

SAA denies wage deadlock

JOHANNESBURG - Wage talks at South African Airways (SAA) are headed towards mediation, while the airline on yesterday moved to distance itself from perceptions it had sufficient cash to meet high wage demands.

United Association of SA (Uasa) sector manager Willie van Eeden said yesterday that unions were currently awaiting a date for talks under the auspices of the Commission for Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration (CCMA). Wage demands remained unchanged, he said.

On Tuesday, unions in wage negotiations with SAA said they had revised upwards their wage demands from single digits to 11%, after the airline's board chair Dudu Myeni said on Friday SAA was financially sound and "had money". Earlier, Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan had said that SAA would not be granted any further government guarantees until a new board and management were appointed. SAA needs this guarantee to sign off on its financial statements for 2014-15. SAA yesterday denied there was a wage deadlock during negotiations, saying Ms Myeni's comments had been limited to the extent to which the airline could continue to operate without reliance on the state. "Comments made that SAA 'has money' did not imply that the airline has now become profitable," the statement read.

EFF rubbishes ANC's claims that MK liberated SA

JOHANNESBURG - The people, and not the ANC, liberated South Africa from apartheid rule, the EFF has said.

EFF spokesman Mbuyiseni Ndlozi yesterday rubbished the ruling party's triumphant version of its role in the antiapartheid struggle and that of its armed wing, Mkhonto weSizwe. Ndlozi dismissed Mkhonto

weSizwe as useless and lacking the courage to do battle with the then SA Defence Force - unlike its counterparts, the Zimbabwe African National Liberation Army, the military wing of Robert Mugabe's Zimbabwe African National Union, as well as the Zimbabwe People's Revolutionary Army of Joshua Nkomo's Zimbabwe African People's Union, which overcame Ian Smith's Rhodesian forces.

ANC secretary-general Gwede Mantashe said yesterday that Western powers were



intent on destabilising liberation movements in southern Africa with the intention of effecting a regime change because they had become powerful governments which they deemed inconvenient to Western interests.

Mantashe - who recently visited Zimbabwe - said similar efforts at regime change were under way in South Africa but were being carried out under the guise of strengthening democratic institutions. He did not provide proof.

Ndlozi said yesterday the South African struggle had been won not because of the strength of the liberation movement's armed forces, but through protest by unarmed youth and workers .

"It means the people, and not the ANC, liberated South Africa. The people never waited for liberation armies to come and save them from the murderous apartheid regime. Above all, the liberation armies never came, never conducted any war inside the country, except in missions that relied on the very protest ability of our people, Ndlozi said." Times Live

Most bees will not harm humans unless provoked. The most aggressive stinging insects are vespid wasps - including bald-faced hornets and other yellow jackets. All of these insects aggressively defend their nests.

ATHENS - A restructuring of Greece's debt is necessary because otherwise it will not be possible to solve the troubled euro zone member's problems in a sustainable way, the chairman of the White House Council of Economic Advisers told a German newspaper." At the moment a restructuring of the Greek debt burden is the most important issue. Without it there won't be a sustainable solution for the problems," Jason Furman said in an interview with Handelsblatt published last night. UN concerned about Austria's law

GENEVA - The United Nations' Human Rights chief is concerned about Austria's tough new asylum law, which allows a process under which migrants could be turned away at the border within an hour, he said in an interview. Austria, a country of 8.5 million, has mostly served as a conduit into Germany for refugees and migrants from the Middle East and Africa but it has also absorbed around 100 000 asylum seekers since last summer. After initially welcoming refugees, the government capped the number of asylum claims it would accept this year at 37 500 and has made family reunification harder for migrants.

'More debris 'almost' from MH370'

Two more pieces of debris were all but confirmed Thursday to be from flight MH370, adding fresh clues to the mystery of the Malaysia Airlines plane which is presumed to have crashed at sea. The fragments washed up on beaches in South Africa and Mauritius in March and brought to the Australian Transport Safety Bureau's laboratories for testing. After an expert examination they were found to have "almost certainly" come from the fated Boeing 777 aircraft, which vanished en route from Kuala Lumpur to Beijing on March 8, 2014 with 239 passengers and crew on board. How the Queen's umbrella 'acted like satellite dish'

LONDON - The Queen's unguarded comments about President Xi's 'rude' Chinese team would never have come out without her plastic umbrella, royal sources revealed today.

The furore centres on a conversation between the Queen and Metropolitan Police Commander Lucy D'Orsi, at the monarch's first garden party of the season at Buckingham Palace on Tuesday.

Her majesty was clutching a clear plastic brolly in the drizzle, but it appears it amplified her comments and sent them towards a microphone belonging to her own personal cameraman.

If her majesty was using a typical umbrella or the sun had been shining her comments would not have surfaced.

An insider told the Telegraph: 'If she had been holding an umbrella

made of fabric, it wouldn't have happened.

'But because it's plastic, it

reflects the sound like a satellite dish.'

The sovereign's uncharacteristically indiscreet remarks were picked up by cameraman Peter Wilkinson.

He unwittingly fed the footage to broadcasters, which aired it on the News at Ten in a report on an earlier diplomatic mishap by the Prime Minister.

Wilkinson has been the Queen's cameraman for 18 years. But he is employed by the BBC, ITV and Sky - and therefore could not choose to edit out the comments even if he had spotted them.

Earlier he had filmed David Cameron filmed telling the monarch that Afghanistan and Nigeria were fantastically corrupt.

Wilkinson had used a sensitive directional microphone to ensure he picked up the Prime Minister's address at a Palace reception to mark the Queen's 90th birthday.

Hours later her majesty attended the garden party where she spoke openly to Met Commander D'Orsi.

This time Wilkinson had changed his microphone to a less sensitive one he uses for such occasions, but it appears the Queen's umbrella amplified her words towards him.

Chin has censored coverage of the Queen describing senior Chinese officials as 'very rude'.

The usually guarded monarch yesterday found herself at the centre of a diplomatic panic after her candid comments were unwittingly captured by her official cameraman and aired on the BBC.

China responded by censoring reports on the broadcaster's World Service and blocking web pages that mentioned the royal slip-up.

Italy gives green light to gay marriages

Milan-Italy's parliament has given the green light to the introduction of gay civil unions, becoming the last major Western country to legally recognise same-sex relationships.

The Roman Catholic Church has strongly opposed the legislation and in January tens of thousands of protesters packed a square in central Rome to demonstrate against the laws.

But Italy's left-wing Prime Minister Matteo Renzi has said it is a key issue for equality and he said on Facebook before the vote on Wednesday that it was a 'day of celebration'. Politicians in the Chamber of Deputies voted 369-193 in favour of a vote of confidence in Mr Renzi's government, which makes final approval of the civil unions bill automatic.

The bill itself is expected to be passed later today. Although the legislation has been hailed as a civil rights landmark there has been criticism by some gay rights groups who say it still does not give homosexual couples the same rights as heterosexual couples in regards to issues like adoption. Dilma Rousseff suspended

SAO PAULO - Less than halfway through her elected mandate, Dilma Rousseff has been stripped of her presidential duties for at least six months after senators voted 55-22 to impeach her and put her on trial.

After what one politician called the "saddest day for Brazil's young democracy", a majority of the senators voted after a late-running impeachment debate that they would vote to suspend the Workers' party leader, putting economic problems, political paralysis and alleged fiscal irregularities ahead of the 54 million votes that

put her in office. Rousseff, Brazil's first female president, will have to step aside for at least six months while she is tried in the upper house for allegedly manipulating government accounts ahead of the previous election. Her judges will be senators, many of whom are accused of more serious crimes.

The decision is likely to be more political than legal. After Rousseff came to power in 2010, she initially enjoyed some of the highest ratings of any leader in the world. But her popularity has slumped along with the economy, now in its deepest recession for decades.

'Trump should be disqualified from race'

NEW YORK - Former GOP nominee Mitt Romney slapped Donald Trump for the presumptive Republican nominee's refusal to release his taxes.

'It is disqualifying for a modernday presidential nominee to refuse to release tax returns to the voters, especially one who has not been subject to public scrutiny in either military or public service.' Romney wrote yesterday in a strongly-worded Facebook post.

Despite pressure, Trump said vesterday that he doesn't expect to release his tax returns before November, citing an ongoing audit of his finances. Romney concluded from Trump's foot-dragging that there must be 'a bombshell of unusual size' tucked inside.

Romney, a businessman in his own right who lost the presidential election to President Barack Obama in 2012, has used the 'bombshell' line before, attempting to pressure Trump in February to release his income taxes.

At that time the former Massachusetts governor speculated to Fox News that Trump's income may not be as large as the billionaire boasts or he may not have fully paid his taxes. Daily Mail



Allardyce's side secure safety

LONDON - Are you watching Newcastle?' the locals asked. Why would they, with the outcome so resoundingly certain. Who wants to witness his own funeral?

Sam Allardyce versus Everton? Well, there was only ever going to be one winner there. And what a win it was. Confident, emphatic; Sunderland were two goals clear by half-time and the third made certain of three points with 34 minutes remaining. Allardyce has done an outstanding job here.

Sunderland were significant odds on for relegation when he took over on October 9, with just three points from eight games. They were a place off the bottom and averaging 0.37 points per match; carry on like that and they would have been gone quicker than Aston Villa. Allardyce has raised that to 1.2 points per game. Had he been in from the start, Sunderland would be where Everton and Watford are now, and comfortable.

In a season when Leicester and Claudio Ranieri have performed the impossible,

Allardyce's more earthbound skill for keeping a bad team from doom - he has maintained his record of never being relegated - is hardly fashionable, but not every year is going to bring miracles and miracle workers.

There will always be a number of clubs that need simple security, and that is what he offers. He is much more than a Red Adair rescue act, though, and the way he has turned this diseased club around, under pressure, and with only one flaky January transfer window to make improvements cannot be underestimated.

So events at the end of last season were for the best after all. Shaking hands with West Ham was right for both parties. They have moved on and so has he – appreciated on Wearside in a way he never was in east London. They love him up here, singing his name - that rarely happened at Upton Park and parading banners of appreciation around the perimeter.

In turn, he feels that affection, joining the lap of honour at the end with a big, goofy grin and clowning around with those whose support is most vocal. He is their guy. They are ecstatic with the way he has saved them, and the way he has simultaneously condemned Newcastle to a wilderness beyond the richest Premier League in history. Daily Mail

Newcastle United prove money can't buy success

NEWCASTLE - Newcastle have been relegated to the Championship despite having the second-highest net spend on transfer fees of any club in the Premier League this season.

The reeling North East giants spent more than any other club in the winter transfer window.

Too little, too late was the feeling in when Newcastle spent £28.5million on four players in January - Jonjo Shelvey, Henri Saivet, Andros Townsend and Seydou Doumbia - and so it has proved.

Still, it is remarkable to note - whatever went on in the seasons before - that a club can be relegated over the course of a season in which they have spent £76.3m on players.

Only Manchester City had a higher net spend than Newcastle's £70.1m over the season - as revealed by Sportsmail's Nick Harris in February.

It is no wonder then that serious question marks are hanging over the heads of the men who oversaw that spending; chief scout Graham Carr and their managing director Lee Charnley.

Those signings in full: Georginio Wijnaldum (£14.5m), Aleksandar Mitrovic (£13m), Chancel Mbemba (£8.5m), Ivan Toney (£0.5m), Florian Thauvin (£12m), Saivet (£5m), Shelvey (£12m), Townsend (£12.5m) and Doumbia (loan).

LIVERPOOL - First he jinked past Adam Lallana, then skipped away from Roberto Firmino.

After that, he flummoxed James Milner and wrong-footed Emre Can before applying the coup de grace.

Using Dejan Lovren as a shield, he opened up his body and unleashed a right-foot shot that zipped into the net, racing past Simon Mignolet before the goalkeeper could react. It was glorious, a moment to illuminate a hundrum game.

It was, quite simply, Eden Hazard at his brilliant best. Too little, too late, many will argue and indeed, it wasn't enough. Substitute Christian Benteke rose in injury time to steal the Belgian's limelight and ensure Liverpool pilfered a point.

'He had a difficult year,' said Guus Hiddink, Chelsea's interim manager.

'He was one of the best last year and this year he is falling into injury, coming back, falling back into injury and that made him vulnerable physically, so you get frustrated.

'The last few weeks he has been working on a programme to be fully fit and now steadily he has got his shape and then you can see what he is able to do. He is conceding a lot of physical contacts but he goes on. He is physically and mentally fit and it is a pleasure to see those sort of players.'

Not so long ago, when the fires were lit by Jose Mourinho and Rafa Benitez, this was the game of the season, with rancour guaranteed on and off the pitch.

MARTINEZ SACKED

EVERTON - Roberto Martinez has been sacked as Everton manager.

Martinez, who had overseen a run of just one win in the last 10 matches, was relieved of his duties to spare him the ordeal of taking charge of the final match of the campaign against Norwich.

The Catalan, who was appointed in June 2013 after winning the FA Cup with Wigan, lost Everton's supporters and the appetite for a change of manager among the fan base was overwhelming. He reached the point of no return.

Frank de Boer is the early favourite to succeed him after leaving Ajax while his fellow Dutchman Ronald Koeman, in charge of Southampton, is also fancied. David Unsworth, the Everton Under 21s manager, will take charge of the side against Norwich.

The weight of public feeling towards Martinez was something new major investor Farhad Moshiri could no longer ignore and the decision has been taken following Wednesday's 3-0 capitulation at Sunderland.



Everton's players were on a scheduled day off yesterday but Martinez, who usually arrives in for work every day at 8am, did not come into Finch Farm, the club's training base, as normal. Following the no-show, the players concluded they had lost their manager.

Their end-of-season awards would be staged at St George's Hall in Liverpool city centre last evening and fans were expected to congregate on St George's Plateau to protest about Martinez's performance.

This is not a decision that Everton's board would have wanted to take – they had only sacked one manager since the turn of the century – but results, particularly since the turn of the year, had been impossible to ignore. Following defeat at the hands of the Premier League's 17th-placed side Martinez remained defiant about his future - and claimed the FA Cup semifinal defeat by Manchester United had hit them hard.

Asked if he believed he retained his players' support, the former Wigan boss said: "100 per cent - I know the players gave everything they had."

"Since the FA Cup semifinal it has been difficult for us to get that belief and intensity in the league and Sunderland were the opposite - a fully focused team who created a good momentum because they were close to finishing the job."

Pochettino signs new Spurs deal

LONDON - Mauricio Pochettino has committed his future to Tottenham Hotspur by signing a new five-and-a-half-year deal that will keep him in north London until 2021.

The Argentine manager verbally agreed to the new contract last month but has now put pen to paper on the long-term deal believed to be worth £5.5million per year.

Spurs announced the news on Twitter yesterday and confirmed that first team coaches Jesus Perez, Miguel D'Agostino and Toni Jimenez had also agreed to contract extensions.

Huge boost

It will come as a huge boost to Tottenham to tie down their impressive young manager, whose work at White Hart Lane has not gone unnoticed in the boardrooms of top rival clubs.

The 44-year-old and the club have concluded months of negotiations to extend his previous deal that still had three years to run until 2019 and the fresh terms make him the highest paid manager in the club's history.

Pochettino said: 'I could not be happier to sign this new contract. It was an easy decision for my coaching staff and I because we can feel the appreciation of everyone here – there is no better place to be right now.'

'Danny the Dodger' absent from another FIFA meeting

CAPE TOWN -The Democratic Alliance says it has established that Danny Jordaan will once again miss an important FIFA gathering, the 66th FIFA Congress which to kick off in Mexico City on yesterday.

"This will be the third FIFA meeting Jordaan has missed since the US attorney-general identified two South Africans as co-conspirators in the 2010 World Cup bribery allegations," DA spokesman on sports and recreation Solly Malatsi said.

Jordaan had already told BBC World Football and New Africa journalist, Osasu Obayiywana, that he was "very unlikely" to attend the FIFA congress in Mexico City, which was meant to take place yesterday and today, Malatsi stated.




"Obiyaywana also said that responding to the allegations made about an alleged \$10m bribe to Jack Warner would be 'a distraction at this time' and that he (Jordaan) had been asked by the ANC to concen-

trate on the August mayoral elections," Malatsi asserted.

"It is now clear that Jordaan has conveniently abandoned many of his FIFA-related international commitments as SAFA President. It is time for the rest of the leadership of SAFA to initiate a motion of no confidence against Jordaan since he no longer has time to fulfil his obligations.

"He must stop using his mayoral obligations as an excuse for his no shows at FIFA meetings and to neglect his SAFA duties," Malastsi added.

JOHANNESBURG - Quinton Fortune says new administration for the South African Football Association could change the country's fortunes.

"We need to get rid of them, clean the slate, put in football people, people that understand the game. The values need to change with our football association. I'm so passionate about this because I know what we (Bafana Bafana) are capable of doing," said Fortune.

The former Manchester United player added that if there are no mindset changes, nothing will change.

"Until that changes and the mindset changes, I'm afraid we going to be in this position that we are in now for a very long time," he explained.

Being a player who played at the highest level for almost 20 years, he believes that Bafana are capable of being the best in the world.

"We (South Africa) have the talent and the ability to win the World Cup, not compete in the World Cup, but win the World Cup," added the former Atlético Madrid player.

Fortune said the likes of Lucas Radebe, Delron Buckley, Shaun Bartlett, and Bradley Carnell could be ideal candidates for SAFA administration.

"If someone has played the game, I'm sure I want to use that person because he understands the trade, he understands what the players think, and he understands what is needed. You have to create the environment that players want to play for the national team," Fortune said.

Fortune used FC Twente's Kamohelo Mokotjo as an example of SAFA's shaky administration.

The 25-year-old Mokotjo played for all SAFA's junior teams, and is a star player in the Dutch Eredivisie but for some reason, Shakes Mashaba did not use him enough, which subsequently prompted him to reconsider his availability for Bafana call-ups. The Citizen

the Port Elizabeth outfit remain in the top eight of the Absa Premiership for the better part of the 2015/16 season.


"It's a done deal. James Okwuosa has signed for Orlando Pirates. He will be playing for Pirates next season," a source told the Siya crew.



Swallows beat Correctional Services outfit Green Mamba 2-1 during the finals of the tournament played at the Somhlolo National Stadium last Sunday.


The Mbabane giants will be presented their E1million cheque while the runners-up will receive their E350 000 prize.

Sihlangu's 2-0 victory one of 'COSAFA Classics'

SOCCER – THE national team Sihlangu's 2-0 victory against Zimbabwe in 2002 has been described as one of the COSAFA Castle Cup's Classics.

The two sides met in the quarterfinals of the tournament played in Harare, Zimbabwe.

Information sourced from the COSAFA website is that the clash was one of the great shocks in the early years of the COSAFA Castle Cup and still remains one of the biggest upsets in the competition's near two-decade history.

"At the time it was arguably the biggest victory in the history of the Swaziland national side, which was then ranked number 132 in the world, but came away with a victory against a home team placed 67 positions above them. It was the first time Swaziland had beaten Zimbabwe and the first away win for the Swazis in six years of competing in the annual southern African championship.

"Strikers Siza 'King Pele' Dlamini and Sibusiso 'Spoko' Dlamini both scored in the second half against a Zimbabwean side featuring five overseasbased professionals in their starting line-up."

Siza Dlamini burst through the midfield and shrugged off several defenders, running half the length of the pitch before chipping over Zimbabwe's goalkeep-

er Tapuwa Kapini for the opening goal on the

hour mark.

and striker Benjani
Mwaruwari, who
back then played in
Switzerland with

Grasshoppers, carved out several chances for the hosts in the opening 15 minutes.

But as the game progressed Swaziland gained in confidence and sealed a remarkable victory in stoppage time when Sibusiso Dlamini outsprinted the goalkeeper to a loose ball and scored into an empty net from a tight angle," reads part of the statement.

Swaziland are said to have advanced to the semifinals to meet South Africa, where they were beaten 4-1 by the eventual champions.

Interestingly, Sihlangu have been drawn against Zimbabwe, Seychelles and Madagascar in Group A and will play the Zimbabwean Warriors in their first game of the regional tournament this year.

'Amabhubesi' are currently perched on position 10 with 21 points after 21 games in the log table.


They need a win to avoid the dreaded relegation axe.

Green Mamba want E12 000 court order set-aside

SOCCER – CORRECTIONAL Services outfit Green Mamba were at the High Court to rescind an order granted in favour of their former assistant coach Bheki Simelane, who is demanding E12 000 from the team.

An affidavit filed by the team's Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Thamie Phakathi, who is represented by Advocate Mduduzi Mabila acting on the instruction of N. Ndlangamandla and S. Jele Attorneys, is seeking for the order granted by the court on March 17 to be set aside until the finalisation of this application.

The team has filed an urgent application seeking that the order be rescinded or set aside as the Premier League of Swaziland (PLS), cited as the second respondents in the matter, now wants to garnishee their SwaziBank Cup gate takings, which he said would be to their great prejudice.

"Pending finalisation of the application, I

humbly request for a stay of the execution order. On the April 27, the applicant received an order from this honourable court directing that the applicants pays the first respondent

Bheki Simelane a sum of E12 000 in respect of outstanding salaries for the months of October, November,

nonths of October, November, December, January," reads part of the affidavit.

In his defence, Phakathi said the order sought by Simelane was granted erroneously after the first respondent failed to adhere to the provisions of Part VII of the Industrial Relations Act 2005 (as amended).

He stated that Simelane should have reported a dispute with the

Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration
Commission (CMAC) before the matter could

be deliberated at the High Court, especially because he has since reported the matter with CMAC. The CEO mentioned that he had a reasonable explanation for his default and further has bona fide defence to Simelane's claim.

"I further believe this application is bona fide and is not made with the intention to delay the proceedings. The Applicant has every intention of having Simelane back at work since he was never dismissed from his employment," he said.

Phakathi submitted that should the matter take its normal course, the Applicant would not have been afforded substantial redress at a hearing in due course as by then the matter would have been over taken by events as the deductions would have been effected on the gate takings yet Simelane also has an application before CMAC where he is demanding E48 000.
