





JSC MAN HANDLING PM'S DIVORCE APPLICATION

PRIME Minister Sibusiso Dlamini has instructed Judical Service Commission (JSC) member Musa Dlamini to represent him in his divorce against wife Pastor Joy Maziya.

Dlamini is a lawyer by profession and operates a law firm in Mbabane styled as ML Dlamini Attorneys.

The law firm has been instructed to handle the divorce case by Dlamini where he has applied for a decree of divorce against his wife for alleged malicious dissertion.

Dlamini filed the summons before the High Court and gave his wife 14 days to file replying papers in the matter that has been kept a top secret at the High Court.

The court file, the Swazi Observer has learnt, is not being kept at the civil registry just like other court cases.

The judicial service commission commissioner was a member of the JSC last year when the former chief justice Michael Ramodibedi was The law firm has been instructed to handle the dirvorce case by Dlamini where he has applied for a decree of divorce against his wife for alleged malicious dissertion

impeached for charges of serious misconduct. Ramodibedi was called to appear before the JSC for impeachment and he wanted it to be reconstituted citing a number of issues.

Biased

He said the commission was going to be biased against him and claimed that Musa was a personal lawyer to the Prime Minister, therefore, his presence in the commission would influence it to reach a partial verdict.

He had accused the prime minister of orchestrating the moves to oust him and the pressing of trumped-up charges, which was a violation of section 414 (4) of the constitution which stipulates that a judge cannot be liable to suit for action taken in the exercise of judicial power.

Ramodibedi lost the application seeking the recusal of the JSC and was eventually dismissed after the commission had recommended to His Majesty the King.

Pastor Joy has filed a notice showing intent to defend the matter and has instructed Rodrigues Attorneys in the matter.

She is expected to file replying papers before the end of this month as she was given 14 days to do so.

She filed the notice of intention to defend on April 8, 2016 which means that she is expected to have filed her papers on or before April 28, 2016.

Violent

The prime minister has accused his wife of being violent and jealous of his interactions he had with other women.

This included women the prime minister had to work with. In the combined summons, it was alleged that his wife would lose her temper whenever the prime minister interacted with other women.

Efforts to have access to the file hit a snag yesterday and the registry office was reported to only have booked a case number.

It was reported that the file was not in the possession of junior staff members.

Futile

Efforts to get a comment from the Registrar of the High Court Siphiwo Mabila proved futile as she did not answer her phone yesterday evening.

Secretary of the law Society Nkosinathi Manzini said he would not be able to comment on the issue for now until the whereabouts of the file was disclosed.

A senior legal practitioner who spoke on condition of anonymity said all court documents became public once they have been registered and allocated a case number

In the prime minister's summons it was alleged that Maziya was violent towards the prime minister and their support staff and at some point she used a broomstick to mete out punishment on an assistant.

The PM has also alleged that the pastor once physically assaulted a bodyguard.

Dlamini's life with wife was alleged to have become unbearable as a result of her behaviour. The Swazi Observer has learnt that the prime minister has filed amended papers in the case following the filing of Pastor Joy's notice of intention to defend.

Last week, the Swazi Observer reported that the Director of the Swaziland National Library Services had fired her police bodyguards and accused them of leaking information to the media.

Parents need to be involved in condoms issue - SNAT

SEEMINGLY, most of the stakeholders involved in giving pupils education in schools are not fans of the idea of distributing condoms for children in schools.

Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) said they would not commit themselves on the matter all by themselves because pupils did not only belong to them as teachers. SNAT Secretary General Muzi Mhlanga said there were many stakeholders who had to be involved in this matter because children did not only belong to them as teachers, but also to parents at home.

"We think NERCHA should involve all the stakeholders in this matter in order for a decision to be taken collectively. We do appreciate the fact that such matters should be discussed because they are there and they happen, that it is why even sexual and reproductive lessons are given in schools. We cannot allow condoms to be distributed because as SNAT, we feel such would be legalising sex

before marriage," Mhlanga said.

He reminded pupils that it was good for them to take care of themselves because there were negative effects of engaging in sexual activities during the early stages of their lives. He said it was better for them to engage in sexual activities when they were ready to do so. He also advised parents at home to also be mindful of the fact that their children would be sexually active during the course of their lives. He said d that was not to say they should just let them engage in such activities but they should also talk about such matters and find ways to overcome such challenges that came with children who in such

Temporary teachers not paid since January

POVERTY and hunger seems to be taking its toll among temporary teachers who are said to be working without getting paid since January this year.

This situation is said to have caused an outcry among the teachers and their relatives.

The quality of education is said to be compromised as the situation continues to affect their morale and are barely able to survive. One organisation that is severely pained by the situation is the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT). SNAT Secretary General Muzi Mhlanga, when contacted by this publication, did confirm that such was the situation in schools.

"Temporary teachers were not paid since January this year. We do not know why this is the case. One concerned relative of one of the teachers came to our office to complain about this situation. She said she was coming from TSC to find out why such is happening," Mhlanga said.

TSC stands for Teaching Service Commission. This is an organisation that is under the ministry of education

and training. It is responsible for hiring, disciplining and firing teachers who are found to be misbehaving at work.

All the welfare of teachers are said to be taken care of by this body.

Mhlanga went on to state that the relative was told by TSC staff that she would have to accept the current situation and move on because the staff members were no longer given overtime allowances to deal with such issues.

Referred

This matter, according to Mhlanga, made SNAT engage the Ministry of Education and Training Principal Pat Muir, who referred them to the ministry of public service and the ministry of public service said the problems rest with TSC.

The secretary general also pointed out that the problem affecting temporary teachers also affected qualified teachers who were not posted into their rightful places in order to get their rightful salaries. Mhlanga said such teachers were the ones who had degrees and went on to obtain a Post Graduate Certificate, in Education (PGCE). He said in around 2010, the teachers were hired on a temporary basis to teach at primary schools.

"We had a problem with this set up because these were qualified teachers.

"We engaged government on the matter to find out why they were not employed permanently because they were qualified.

The response we got from there was that this was because the teachers are qualified to teach in high schools and when there were no vacancies there, they would be temporarily employed in primary schools," Mhlanga said.

The SNAT mouthpiece said there was an agreement between them and government that the teachers had to be paid according to the degrees they held even though they were in primary schools.

Mhlanga said some of these teachers are still underpaid. He said the affected teachers are now tasking SNAT with the responsibility of engaging government on this issue.

"The problem now is that the teachers think we are colluding with government to make sure that they are underpaid yet this is not true," he said.

Ministry of Public Service Principal Secretary Evart Madlopha, when reached for comment, asked this publication to direct its questions to the ministry of education and training.

"With due respect, please direct your questions to the ministry of education," Madlopha said.

Ministry of Education Principal Secretary Pat Muir could only say he was supposed to meet SNAT today concerning this issue.

"I am seeing SNAT tomorrow (today) morning for further discussions on this issue," Muir said.

Efforts to get comment from TSC Chairman Simanga Mamba were not successful as his phone was either switched off or out of coverage area.

PRINCESS SIKHANYISO CAUTIONS YOUTH ON CONDOMS

the youth have expressed the desire to have condoms freely distributed in schools

PRINCESS Sikhanyiso is hesitant about the distribution of condoms to the youth.

She voiced out her worry during the High Level Indaba on HIV Prevention for Young People in Swaziland held at Royal Swazi Convention Centre yesterday.

An advocate of abstinence and Imbali herself, the princess indicated that this was against the values she stands for and supports, that of encouraging the youth, especially females, to abstain from sex until marriage. This was after some of the youth stated that they would love to have condoms freely distributed for

The youth want personalised, flavoured condoms

THE youth also added a voice in the HIV prevention Indaba for young people, as they urged the policy makers to avail personalised condoms for them.

They asked for their local role models such as KrTC and Nomalungelo Dladla's images to be in the packages of the condoms.

"These condoms are not going to be available for us the youth to just use them, but would also remind us of the importance of abstinence and also protecting ourselves should we want to engage in sexual relations," Bongiwe said.

She added that just like they tended to buy clothing items with international celebrities because they love and look up to them, 'personalised' condoms would also help in encouraging them (youth) to reach for the stars. Jessica Mulenga, a representative of Shiselweni region, supported the idea of flavoured condoms, saying the current freely distributed condoms had a foul smell, which had many times led to the youth resorting to engaging in sexual activities without protection.

"It is sad that Imbali is the most affected with HIV and since the youth forms about 63 percent of the Swazi population, one can always ask if there will ever be the future. Such interventions are good to help ensure that the youth stay free from infections, but I am a bit hesitant about distributing condoms to the youth because even if they are not sexually active yet, they might be tempted to start using them," she said.

She also did, however, made it clear that this was her own opinion, which does not in any way imply that the stakeholders and policy makers who were present have to change their decisions on availing condoms to the

"It is also best that as we ensure that the country is HIV-free by the year 2022 by imparting knowledge through arts and culture to send the message in a lighter way to Swazis,"

she said. The princess also encouraged companies to make use of out of school youth by granting them job shadowing opportunities, which would help stay away from drugs, sex and alcohol.

'Increase salaries for home based workers'

WAKHILE Dlamini, a youth representative for Lubombo schools, urged the ministry of health to review the salaries of home-based care workers.

He mentioned that this would keep them motivated to do their job effectively and affectionately as they are the most important people in the outskirts of the country to reach out to the youth.

"They play a major role as they reach out to many with love and compassion, so by increasing their salaries, you will be showing that you applaud their good job and also urge them to soldier on," he explained.

Parenting manual to be soon published

A parenting manual will soon be available to parents across the country, to help them understand young minds better.

This was confirmed by Khulisa Umntfwana's Stella Lukhele, who mentioned that this manual would instill the character building for children to parents.

"A child needs to be shaped into a better person from a very tender age and it is always the parents' duty to ensure that such is met, not their school teachers or chiefs.

A character is the HERE: Stella Lukhele shield with which a child showing the parental is protected from factors manual. like peer pressure, as it is the guide that sees him/her shying away from going with the flow," she said. She added that most of the children have dealt with, had complained about their parents, being not able to

communicate well with them, from a young age.

"These children said their parents do not understand their language, nor

do they embrace their growth, so the manual will be for every parent to get through the young people's minds. It is not just for families, but for single parents as well, 'she said.

This parenting manual is still awaiting to be translated into siSwati to cater for those who cannot understand the

English language Lukhele revealed that the manual had already been translated into Siswati, but what was delayinh them now is the lack of funding, from willing sponsors.

UNAIDS boss Sidibe hails king's commitment

UNAIDS Executive Director and UN Under Secretary General Michel Sidibe indicated that the success of the HIV prevention for young people in Swaziland was because of His Majesty King Mswati III's long-time commitment to fight HIV and AIDS.

He mentioned that they had managed to reach out to different chief-

doms due to the support from His Majesty, adding that an HIV-free generation would be achieved by the targeted time because of the King's support.

Prevention

"Prevention of HIV infection to the youth of Swaziland is one of the central actions which will help the country remain strong," he said.

...We want better packaging for ARVs -Youth

THE youth also indicated their concern in the current packaging of the ARVs, saying it is not only youth unfriendly but also draws attention, which most of the time leads to stigmatisation.

They said the current packaging would sometimes make a sound from their bags.

They also revealed that the current ARVs are not in a shape that best describes the youth.

Bongiwe Motsa who represented Manzini schools, emphasised that an HIV free generation can be

achieved, if poverty can be dealt with first.

Poverty

"We all can agree that poverty is tragic and most of the time leads to the youth falling for the wrong crowd, just to make sure they dont go to bed on an empty stomach," she said.

The Ngwane Park High School pupil mentioned that the youth then tended to have sex with older people for monetary and material benefits, which then expose them to HIV infections.

Textile, cleaners wages increased

GOVERNMENT has approved the salary increase of textile and apparel industry workers, including cleaners who will now earn E1 332 per month and E333 weekly.

This is contained in the Government Gazette Regulation of Wages (textile and apparel industry) order of 2016. The gazette describes a cleaner as an employee who is responsible for the cleaning of a factory, offices, toilets, canteen as well as perform tea making duties.

A driver, on the other hand, means an employee in possession of a current drivers licence who is mainly engaged in conveying messages, delivers and collect goods or mail by vehicle and performs simple routine tasks in an office. The new gazette has been signed by Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula.





TIMES EDITOR ARRESTED

HARDLY three months after a reporter from the Times Group of Newspapers was fired for alleged extortion of a client, an editor has been arrested and charged with the same offence.

Times of Swaziland Business Editor Sifiso Sibandze was arrested on Tuesday by the Commercial Crimes Unit of the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) service.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (CPICO) Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed the arrest of Sibandze yesterday.

However, when asked further by this newspaper, Mamba did not want to reveal any details about the matter hence he did not give out details of the person allegedly extorted Sibandze. He said further details would be revealed in court, where Sibandze is expected to appear today.

He is expected to appear at the Mbabane Magistrate's Court.

However, well-placed sources have revealed to this newspaper that Sibandze was arrested with his relative.

They are said to have tried to extort one businessman, whom they contacted through a cellphone and arranged to meet him at one of the well-known hotels in Mbabane.

The businessman is said to be an owner of one of the hardware stores situated in Mbabane. They are said to have pretended to be investigators from the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) and tried to extort the business-

man.

Another Times investigative journalist Mbongeni Ndlela was allegedly fired for by Times Group of Newspapers for cases related to extortion. He is said to have taken the matter to the Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC), where he is challenging his employer, the Times Group of Newspapers, for unfair dismissal.

Furthermore, this is happening six months after a sports reporter Sabelo Gwebu, was arrested for public indecency, wherein he was accused of masturbating in public

Gwebu was arrested in October last year.

He is said to have done that in full view of pupils who are boarders at St Mark's High School. Gwebu, at the time the incident happened, was renting a flat next to St Marks High School. Gwebu appeared before Mbabane Senior Magistrate Phathaphatha Mdluli.

Some MMM Ponzi members remain defiant

SOME members of the MMM Ponzi Scheme are running scared following news that the MMM has collapsed after its founder Russian convict Sergey Mavrodi allegedly went into hiding after announcing that his Bitcoin-based MMM Global scheme had failed and was shutting down

However, a section of the members are in denial and refuse to believe that the ponzi scheme has collapsed, even after numerous reports which appeared in both South African and Swazi media. These firm believers of the 'donating community' refuse to believe that their hard earned money will never return. Some members are already regretting their decision to invest in the ponzi scheme. "I know that it was too good to be true, but because my friends and my colleagues were yielding benefits from it, I said to myself why not.

"I am even afraid to tell my husband that last month I had joined MMM because he had warned my against joining it, saying these schemes always ended the same way," said one unhappy MMM community member. She said some of her friends had 'donated' large amount of monies, which they have acquired through various loans, hoping the money would be doubled in two months.

"Last week there was a special requiring one to invest any amount that would be almost double in two months. Everyone got excited about this and they put in more money, hoping it will come back with a 40% interest in two months. "This is really sad because deep down I had questions, but was overpowered by the results I was witnessing from the people around. I just hope this is a false alarm, otherwise people will get heart attacks from this thing," he said.

Rand rallies to reach highest point

The Rand has rallied against the US Dollar to reach its highest point since December 4 2015.

The rand against the dollar yesterday closed at E14.62/\$.

The rand has been gradually appreciating against the greenback for the past four months; the dollar reached a high of E16.85/\$ before the Rand hit back with successive appreciation against the dollar to reach E14.62/\$, for the first time this year. This will come as good news for the government as this will mean its external debt burden will be reduced because the exchange is favourable as its interest payments, which are denominated in US dollars, will come down. According to BusinessDay "the Rand broke through R14.62/\$, an important psychological level due to the local currency's failure to breach the level after two attempts this year.

"The rand traded at its best level against the US dollar since December 2015, following better than anticipated retail sales," BusinessDay reported.



Ex-Times Journalist wants E148 000 for unfair dismissal By Linda Jele ...claims he was dismissed via SMS

FORMER Times of Swaziland journalist Mbongeni Ndlela wants to be paid E148 000 after

he was allegedly dismissed via a text message.

Ndlela alleged that the dismissal was procedurally unfair.

Mbabane

He reported the Times of Swaziland to the Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC) to dertemine a dispute betwen the two parties.

He alleged that his services as an employee of the publication terminated after he was charged and convicted of misconduct in that he demanded payment from a businessman in order to avoid publishing a story about him.

These are allegations contained in documents filed at CMAC and in the possesison of this publication. The Times of Swaziland is yet to file responding papers.

Absence

Ndlela claimed that he was only served with an official letter dismissing him 64 days after the text message had been sent to him.

He alleged that during the disciplinary hearing pertaining to the charge preferred against him, he was not allowed legal representation and the hearing proceeded in his absence.

He alleged that there was no valid reason for his dismissal and applied to the conciliation body to rule that the Times reinstate body to him or pay him E148 299.52.

The amount comprises E28 510.40 in respect of sevarence alllowance, additional notice amounting to E11 404.16 and payment of E6 058 in lieu of leave. He has also sought an order directing the company to pay him E7 840.50 and E94 086 as notice pay and E400 in respect of monthly performance bonus.

The matter is pending before CMAC.

Ex-Justice Minister gets passport for SA trip

FORMER Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Sibusiso Shongwe has been temporarily given his passport and will be leading a delegation from his church to South Africa.

The former minister is currently out on bail after he was arrested on charges of theft, fraud and violating provisions of the Prevention of Corruption Act.

His international passport was handed over to the investigating officer as part of his bail conditions because he was not allowed to leave the country.

He yesterday filed an urgent application seeking an order to have the passport released to him to enable him to attend a church retreat in the Republic of South Africa.

He submitted that he needed easy access to his passport in order to effectively exercise his right to religion. He was represented by lawyer

David Manica from his law firm Sibusiso B Shongwe and Associates in the matter and it was heard by High Court Judge Qinisile Mabuza.

He submitted, in his affidavit, that he had meticulously abided by the bail conditions eversince he regained his liberty after spending over a month behind bars.

He submitted that he had been selected to lead a delegation of congregants to attend a church retreat in Durban, South Africa. He said he was expected to leave the country on April 19 and return on April 24, 2016. He undertook that the international passport would be returned to the police officer tasked with investigating his case, upon his return.

The office of the director of public prosecutions did not oppose the application and it was granted.

Shongwe had also applied for an order directing that he should be given his passport whenever he needed it without having to seek a court order first.

"I submit that I do not intend to burden the court's roll from time to

time with passport interim release applications as such is not a desirous exercise.

"Moreover, such applications are costly and time consuming. I am advised and verily believe to be true that as an officer of this honourable court I owe a duty to assist this court in its dispensation and administration of justice, hence the present application on the basis of once for

all rule," Shongwe stated.

He also submitted that he had a clear right to the international passport because it was issued by government to him, even though it was currently kept by the investigating officer.

Shongwe was formally charged by the office of the Director of Public Prosecution's Nkosinathi Maseko with seven counts of contravening Sections of the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006.

He was also charged with obstructing the course of justice, theft and fraud. The charges of corruption were related to the politician's alleged involvement in a case where Impunzi Wholesalers and the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) were embroiled in a court battle over tax to be paid for items exported from the Republic of China to the country en-route to South

Cop, lover busted for dagga at police camp

A police officer from the Mbabane Police Post and his girlfriend appeared before the Magistrate's court on two counts of possession of dagga and one of transporting dagga without a valid permit or licence.

The two accused were reportedly caught in possession of 22 dagga plants and 2.165Kg of dagga in the officer's residence at the Mbabane police camp on April 12.

The officer, Constable Thabiso Shongwe, was also charged with transporting the 22 dagga plants from Mankayane to Mbabane on

The prosecution led evidence with the testimony of one Richard Dlamini, a taxi driver who told the court how on April 11 the accused Thabiso Shongwe hired him to drive him (Shongwe) and three other men to Mankayane and back to Mbabane.

According to Dlamini, the men loaded and transported the 22 dagga plants in his (Richard) car. The driver also informed the

...the officer was caught in possession of 22 dagga plants court that officer Shongwe's girl-

friend (Gabisile Ndzabandzaba) was not present during this trip to Mankayane.

In defence, the accused (Shongwe) told the court that his girlfriend and co-accused (Ndzabandzaba) were not involved in the operation in any way other than having been in the residence when the police arrived and arrested them.

Location

In her defence, Ndzabandzaba told the court that she had arrived at the residence at 22:00 hours on April 11 and did not find anyone in the residence. She claimed to have not been aware of her boyfriend's location or activities during the time that he was not at the residence.

Ndzabandzaba claimed that she only discovered the dagga operation at 02:00 hours when her boyfriend returned to the police camp with it.

In closing, the prosecution asked the court to consider Shongwe's status as a law enforcement agent who is expected to uphold the law.

The prosecution recommended a severe sentence to deter other officers of the law from participating in criminal activity.

In mitigation, Shongwe offered an apology to the court and the police force for his actions, saying it was a great embarrassment.

He told the court that he has four children and is responsible for his family household.

Shongwe pleaded with the court to give him an affordable fine because his imprisonment would cause much difficulty to his mother and grandmother, who he said were both on

medication for chronic illnesses and the medication is paid for by him.

Ndzabandzaba told the court that she is sorry for being found in possession while insisting that she had no knowledge of the operation.

Before handing down judgement Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi told Shongwe that "the court has considered that you are an officer of the law, the court cannot treat you as a normal accused."

On the first count, Constable Thabiso Shongwe was fined E5 000 or a five year imprisonment while on the second count he was fined E2 000 or a two year imprisonment.

For the third count, he was fined E2 000 or two years of imprisonment. The sentences will run concurrently. This means the officer will pay E5 000 or face five years imprisonment.

Ndzabandzaba was fined E2 000 or two years imprisonment for the first count and was given the same sentence for count two.

However, this sentence was suspended for three years on condition that she is not caught in possession of any illegal substance.



MABAMBA PRIMARY STAFF NOT PAID SINCE DECEMBER

MABAMBA Primary support staff has not been paid since last December.

This means they have been working for last four months without receiving any remuneration. The school is situated in Nhlangano in the Shiselweni

The support staff consists of the school cook, the school security guard and the secretary, who however, is currently on maternity leave.

The staff said the only explanation they have received from their employer for the non-payment of salaries is that there school has no chairman for the school committee. They have been told that the chairman is the only one who has authority to sign cheques.

riencing problems hence they missed their December salaries.

"The head teacher told us that she is still waiting for the ministry people to come and help in the appointing of a new school's committee. We have been waiting since then.

"This is really sad because when you leave home your family understands that you are going to work and they are expecting food on the table but that does not happen in our scenario, we are as good as unemployed. Our kids are languishing in hunger and we cannot even afford to buy soap for washing," said the aggrieved employee.

The head teacher of the school Prudence Mdluli said she is doing everything she can to try mitigate the problem.

"As I speak I am from the regional

education office to ask for help with regard to this issue. As the head teacher I cannot sign any cheques to pay the staff but the signature of an official school's chairman is necessary," she said.

She further said she is hoping the education office will come to the school next week to help with the appointing of the new school's chairman.

Regional Education Officer Thabile Nxumalo said she is aware of the matter and her office will make sure it is sorted.

"We are still to go to the school and sort the issue," she said.

Nxumalo was, however, unclear on the reason why it has taken her office so long to attend to the matter since it also affects the welfare of the support staff of the school.

Wild soldiers fined E12 000 for bashing defenceless woman

SIX members of Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF) who allegedly went wild and assaulted an unarmed woman with fists and kicks have since been sentenced to six months imprisonment with an option to pay a fine of E2 000 each.

The military men, namely; Sibongo Sifundza, Zinto Fakudze, Maseru Mlipha, Ndumiso Sigwane, Thokozani Mamba and Wiseman Dlamini are alleged to have unlawfully and intentionally assaulted Khanyisile Mbamali with fists, kicks and batons all over her body, resulting in her sustaining serious injuries. They are all based at Mlindazwe Army Barracks.

The woman's injuries were so serious that she had to be admitted to hospital while doctors monitored her condition.

Yesterday, the soldiers appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso for the commencement of their trial. When the charge sheet was read to them they all pleaded guilty to the offence while each of them conducted his own defence. Their pleas were also accepted by the crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the crime.

The senior magistrate, however, asked the army officers to explain before the court what actually happened on the said

The accused persons, speaking separately, stated that they were ordered by their superiors to go and intervene in a fight which was in progress at the complainant's homestead. They alleged that they were informed that some of their colleagues were being assaulted by a group of men at the homestead. The soldiers said that however, on their arrival at the homestead, they discovered that it was just a fight amongst patrons, and the complainant was involved in the fight.

While trying to separate the fighting group of people, the complainant is said to have resisted, something which then earned her a thorough beating by the military men. She had to be hospitalised due to the injuries she sustained.

The accused persons pleaded with the court to be lenient when passing sentence, adding that they did not intend assaulting her. Mavuso, however, condemned the act of the accused persons assaulting civilians while they obligated to protect them. The senior magistrate stated that the accused acted negligently and attacked an unarmed woman.

Mavuso subsequently issued the aforementioned sentence.

Social worker fired for stealing grants

A Pigg's Peak based social worker who had developed a tendency to help himself on children's maintenance grants has been fired.

Director in the Social Welfare Department Moses Dlamini confirmed the dismissal of the officer.

Dlamini said since the dismissal of the officer they had never had the misfortune of seeing money developing legs and mysteriously disappearing. "There was strong suspicion that he was taking the money for his personal use and we were left with no choice but to stop him," said Dlamini.

The officer was reportedly giving himself soft loans

from the money he collected from various parents who were paying for mandatory maintenance grants for their children.

These are mostly men who had been forced by courts or social workers in the Social Welfare Department to maintain their children.

Amounts

They usually pay money in varying amounts from as little as E300 to as much as E10 000 or even more, depending on the financial capacity of the parent.

At the Pigg's Peak town based Social Welfare Department, specific days were allocated on which people could make the payments to an appointed government accountant who would in turn issue the paying individual with a receipt.

Because the accountant could not be available everyday of the week, this particular officer then allegedly saw an opportunity to collect the money himself on the understanding that he would keep it in a safe lockable place within the department.

Loaning

But, as it turned out, that was never to be, as the officer started loaning himself with the hope that he would repay the money

When the time came for the beneficiary of the money to collect it, the officer would then offer excuses as opposed to money, promising to pay it at a later date. It only took one infuriated woman, who said enough was enough and refused to take the excuses anymore, demanding her child's main- being sent home.

tenance grant on the spot, which the officer could not provide. The woman caused a scene and police had to be called to intervene. This was after more than E1 000 child grant for two months had been paid by the child's father to the woman that could, however, not reach the mother of the child.

The police confirmed taking the officer to his parental home hundreds of kilometres away from Pigg's Peak where his father rescued him from his mess by paying the squandered money on his behalf.

The angry affected woman took it and the Social Welfare Department launched investigations on the matter, whose results saw the implicated officer

Uncle fined E2 000 for fondling niece

A man of Maphungwane, who was arrested for fondling a 14year-old girl under the pretences of demonstrating to her on how men would abuse her, has been sentenced to 12 months imprisonment with an option of E2 000 fine.

Linda Mamba pleaded not guilty to a charge of indecent assault after he was arrested last year. He was alleged to have assaulted the girl who is regarded as a minor by law by touching her breast and buttocks. The complainant had narrated to court on how she was lured by the accused person into his house before he fondled her.

She stated that Mamba called her while she was passing nearby his home and asked that she prepare him some food. While she was busy preparing the food, the accused allegedly grabbed the girl and started fondling her.

The girl managed to escape from the grip of the accused and reported the incident to her parents who subsequently reported it to the police.

During the plea of not guilty, Mamba insisted that he was only demonstrating to the girl how she would be abused by men as she had started hanging around with

The crown successfully proved its case, and the accused person was found guilty of the charge. Yesterday, he was back in court for sentencing as he has been out on bail. When delivering the sentence, the senior magistrate wondered why the accused had to touch the complainant in order for her to understand what he was actually warning her of. The magistrate stated that it was clear that the accused was on a mission to abuse the girl. The sentence was then delivered, upon which the court further ordered that half of the sentence be suspended for a period of three years.

Swazi stranded in Peru: Govt invites family for talks

THE ministry of foreign affairs and international co-operation is still in the dark about the matter concerning the Swazi lady who is said to be stranded in Peru.

Minister for Foreign Affairs and International Co-operation Chief Mgwagwa Gamedze has urged the relatives of Zodwa Shongwe to come forward to the ministry so that it could be easy to help them.

Gamedze said it would not be easy for the ministry to help them if they did not come forward to them to seek the assis-

The minister even went to an extent of wondering if this whole thing was true, "I say this because we still do not

know anything about the matter. If the relatives are there, they should come forward to the ministry in order for them to be helped. It would not be easy to help them if they do not come forward." Gamedze said.

He went on to say he was once phoned by someone who was interested in helping the lady to come back home. However, according to the minister, the matter was followed by the ministry with no success because no one was there to help them. Gamedze assured Shongwe's relatives that the ministry would help them, despite what happened in the past.

"We understand that the lady was sentenced and she served for what she did. The relatives must come and we will help them. We do not care about what happened in the past," he said. When this newspaper made a call to

one of the relatives to find out if they did engage the ministry in the matter, she responded by saying they did engage them.

She said what the officials at the minstry told her was that they did not deal with individuals who did not have proof about what they were talking about.

"The only problem we have right now is the documentantion from Peru is not yet available," she said. Zodwa Shongwe is said to have been arrested in 2010 in Lima, which is the capital city of Peru. She is said to have been arrested for drug trafficking and she is said to have been arrested in the company of her boyfriend, who is said to be from one of the countries in West Africa. Drought effects: Theft of maize rife at Maphungwane

MAPHUNGWANE farmers who went all out against the drought that had affected the country and managed to plough their fields are now compelled to spend nights on the fields to keep guard of sneaky thieves.

Stealing of maize from fields and homesteads is reportedly rife in the area as a result of the acute shortages of food in many households. A drastic increase of cases of theft has been reported to the area's *umphakatsi*.

Residents of the area depend largely on subsistence farming, thus the outcry of hunger of result the El Nino phenomena. It has been gathered that more than half the population of the area now fully depend on handouts from government through the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA).

On numerous occasions, residents have, however, been complaining that the NDMA would take too long before distributing the much needed food. It is for this reason that some of them have found themselves to trespass into other people's fields and steal maize with the sole intention of putting food on the table.

Some would also break into homesteads that have already harvested.

Headman of Bhekizwe community Bhekithemba, Matsenjwa, reported that the theft of maize in the area had reached an alarming level.

"These days we are having too many cases of theft of maize reported to the umphakatsi and this worries us a lot," said Matsenjwa.

Matsenjwa said they were even having difficult meting out punishment to the culprits as it was evident that they were driven by hunger to commit the crimes.

He pointed out that some of those who would be questioned for the theft of maize would either be orphaned or elderly, who were living in extreme poverty.

Maphungwane is one of many areas where most people did not plough their fields in the current season due to the drought.

SD MUST DEVELOP HUMAN CAPITAL IN ICT - AFRALTI



Environmental Affairs Jabulani Mabuza; STA CEO Eric Maseko said the new venture would have enormous spin-offs for Siphocosini communities.

'This new venture will significantly address current socio-economic problems faced by Siphocosini

community. Some of these, and which are generally inherent with many other communities, include the prevalence of HIV, high unemployment, income inequality and poverty," said Maseko.

Maseko said the launch of this community-tourism project would create and increase employment opportunities in the community. He said appropriate frameworks that would guide efforts to gender equality and increase opportunities for women and girls' empowerment would also be put in place.

"This community-run venture will

create and expand occupational activities for the youth to encourage positive behaviour change in the community, and will also empower arts and craft groups from the area, as we anticipate massive traffic to the area," said Maseko.

People from surrounding areas, such as Mbabane as well as from other places, for a long time, have yearned for a scenic leisure place that was away, but not far from the urban area, hence the Luphohlo Recreation Park is likely to be an instant hit, said Maseko. STA, said Maseko, was approached by the community about two years ago, to assist set up such a venture. The organisation started building the facilities last year, and will officially hand over the running of the place to a trust set up by the community.

"As much as we funded the project, the local youth also volunteered their time and assisted in the clearing of the land and erecting of the fence, and we are humbled to see such commitment," said Maseko. .About Luphohlo Recreation Park

LUPHOHLO Recreation Centre is found west of Mbabane city, along the road to Mhlambanyatsi.

It is on the banks of the Luphohlo Dam from the northern side of the main road. The dam is owned by the Swaziland Electricity Company, and is primarily used for power generation. The area surrounding the dam and identified for the project is Swazi Nation Land. Siphocosini community, in spite of its close proximity to the capital city Mbabane, is a relatively poor community that offers its people limited livelihood options. Most of the members live a subsistence lifestyle that depends on cattle rearing and/or dry farming for living. Opportunities for livelihood depend on the availability of rains through summer, a situation which

has become largely unpredictable and undependable.

High and inter-generational unemployment and high concentration of low income households make Siphocosini community as vulnerable as any other in the country. All these tough consequences are putting young people at the centre to bear the most severe impact of poverty, extending oppor nities for HIV infection,

increase the risk of food security.

Therefore, a need exist that steps are taken to improve the community, more especially the youths' vulnerable outlook. It is considered that the establishment of the Luphohlo Recreational Park, would significantly address constrains that make the Siphocosini community an economically and socially depressed community.

TWO MEN DISOWN BAGS OF DAGGA IN COURT

TWO men who were allegedly nabbed for the possession of dagga have claimed that the illegal herb they were found with was not theirs but belonged to a third man who ran away.

The two, Wandile Sifundza from Nyakatfo and Phumelele Masina from Bulandzeni were allegedly found with dagga weighing 6.5 kilograms, at Nkamazi.

They pleaded not guilty before Senior Magistrate Siphosini Dlamini as they claimed that the rightful owner of the dagga ran away from the police.

Arresting officer Constable Sizwe Mazibuko said after being tipped off by the public, he and Sergeant Du Pont, set up a roadblock at Nkamazi intersection.

"My partner and I then saw a 1988 Toyota Corolla sedan silver in colour heading towards us at a high speed. The driver of the car upon seeing us made a sharp left turn onto a gravel road heading towards distant homesteads but before then, we saw a large black refuse bag being thrown out of

the left passenger's side window. Upon seeing that we picked up that refuse bag and found a sack smelling of dagga. Upon collection of the sack we proceeded to pursue the car along the gravel road," the police said in court

Mazibuko went on to say that upon apprehending the car ordering its driver to stop.

"A taxi man named Wandile Sifundza was behind the wheel and in the back left seatwas Phumelele Masina. Both were arrested for dagga possession," the police added in court.

Both Masina and Sifundza pleaded not guilty to all charges further disclaiming the alleged sack of dagga which they claimed belonged to the random hitchhiker.

Magistrate Dlamini postponed the matter till May 23, so as to allow the defence to develop its case.

Teacher stabbed for punishing a pupil

A teacher has been left seriously injured after a woman assaulted him for allegedly beating up her child.

The woman, Nomcebo Kunene appeared before Magistrate Lucia Lukhele to answer for the charge of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

Kunene allegedly stabbed Sive Simelane with a sharp object on the head neck and chest.

Accused

Simelane who is a teacher by profession, said the bone of contention was that the accused said he had beaten up her child.

He said Kunene found him enjoying drinks with his friends when she accused him.

"Kunene said she will

teach me a lesson so that I never mess with her child again. However, I did not take Kunene's threats seriously until she came back with a broken beer bottle which she used to assault me and I ended up in hospital," Simelane said in court.

Simelane who had visible gashing wounds on his face stated that he was injured on the face and chest adding that he had to spend a night in hospital, was stitched up and released the following day.

The accused pleaded not guilty to the charge.

She said all she did was act in self defence as it was the teacher who hit her with the beer bottle on the face. Kunene told the court that all she did was confront the teacher on why he beat up her child.

Corporal punishment 'forces' pupil to drop out of school

TWO male pupils have dropped out of Nkwene High due to harsh corporal punishment at the school.


The pupils were doing Form Four and Five respectively.

It is said pupils get punished for offences such as late coming, which is mainly caused by travelling long distances to the school.

10 strokes per pupil, form part of the punishment which proved too much for the young men.

It is said that last year, the deputy headteacher was reported to the Regional Education Officer (REO) as parents raised alarm bells at the school's practises.

"My son dropped out of school after he was suspended for late



coming, for a whole month which resulted in him losing interest in school, one parent lamented.

"The deputy does not care even if you were absent from school because of sickness or compassion. Once a pupil is absent, they get six strokes," a teacher said. The Swaziland Action Against Abuse (SWAGGA) has been called to address the issue.

Meanwhile, Shiselweni Regional Education Officer Thabile Nxumalo refused to comment, saying this matter has already been settled.

Allow Zuma to finish his term - Gauteng ANC leagues

JOHANNESBURG -Accept President Jacob Zuma's apology and let him finish his term of office, the ANC Gauteng's Youth, Women's and Veterans' leagues said on Wednesday.

"The right decision as per ANC Gauteng resolution is for President Jacob Zuma to finish his term," ANC Youth League chairperson Matome Chiloane told reporters in Johannesburg.

He warned against creating a trend of removing presidents, saying the ruling party did not need to help the opposition's "dirty agenda".

"We call on society and especially our members to accept the apology, to focus on elections," Chiloane said.

"It takes a real leader to apologise and say 'I have made a mistake'."

On April 1, a day after the Constitutional Court found he failed to uphold the

Constitution, Zuma apologised for the "frustration and confusion" the Nkandla matter had caused.

All three leagues said it was critical to protect the ruling party's unity and vowed to present a united front in Port Elizabeth at the weekend, where Zuma would launch the party's manifesto for the 3 August local government elections.

The leagues downplayed divisions within the Gauteng branch following a statement by Gauteng ANC's PEC on Tuesday, which said Zuma should "do the right thing". The statement, however, stopped short of saying Zuma should step down.

This was despite a source telling News24 and ANC Gauteng chairperson Paul Mashatile telling the Mail & Guardian that the Gauteng ANC PEC had resolved that Zuma should step down.

56-year-old man taken to court for children support

A 56-year-old man from Sidvokodvo has taken his three elder children to court for failure to help him take care of his two younger children.

The magistrate's court heard how Muzi Dlamini called his three elder children to court claiming that they did not help him feed his two younger children that belonged to Dumisile Ndwandwe.

Ndwandwe had originally taken Dlamini to court for maintenance and she further said Dlamini owed her E12 000 in child support.

Ndwandwe told the court that Dlamini had not supported his two young children aged seven and four since August 2009.

Dlamini was originally ordered to pay E1 200 per month in child maintenance by the court but failed to do so and was served with a contempt of court charge.

Dlamini then claimed that he had three adult working children from his first wife who did not support him financially.

The court then called the three



adults Nobuhle Dlamini, Sibusiso Dlamini and Nhlanhla Dlamini who all claimed that they had no idea that their father had young children with another woman.

They disputed the fact that they did not help their father financially.

All three produced evidence of how they would support their father who they claim also failed to support one of their younger siblings who was still at school.

After hearing the different testi-

monies from Dlamini's children, Magistrate Simangele Mbatha ordered the old man to apologise for accusing his children of not helping

Dlamini was then ordered to produce his payslip and upon further inspection, the magistrate asked him why he was not supporting his younger children yet he earned a reasonable salary.

Dlamini then told the court that he had so many debts from various shylocks as he fathered many children, so he had been paying school fees and other bills.

Dlamini was then asked how he would pay the E12 000 child support that he had owed for all these years.

Ndwandwe was also persuaded to assist Dlamini by reducing the monthly child support to only E600 per month instead of the E1 200 to which Ndwandwe agreed.

Dlamini was ordered to pay E600 per month until August 29.

There after Dlamini would pay E800 per month.

He was also sentenced to one year in a correctional facility without the option of a fine for contempt of court.

The sentence was suspended for three years.

He made it clear that they were not paid any salary or even

an allowance for their time and service spent doing government work, with others having been volunteering for the past two years. Most of the officers were hoping that their efforts would be recognised and appreciated by the government so that in the event vacancies opened up, they would be given first preference and be hired.

With the government engaged on a decentralising drive to improve service delivery to the public, more social workers are

needed. Attempts by the department to hire 57 social workers have been thwarted by the Civil Service Commission's (CSC) apparent delay to conclude the recruitment process and appoint deserving officers. Whilst the DPM's Office seeks to employ more officers, government on

the other hand is struggling to maintain the huge wage bill which is taking a large chunk of the country's gross domestic product. This is much against advice from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) for the country to curb the ballooning wage bill.



IT seems as if the authorities at Mpolonjeni will have to answer on why they are not protecting Mhawu Gwebu and leave his maize crops to be devoured by cattle owned by his neighbours.

Federation of Organisations of Disabled Persons in Swaziland (FODSWA) President Mandla Methula rebuked the action of the people of Mpolonjeni for ill-treating Gwebu and depriving him of his crops that were meant to take care of him and his family.

"The neighbours of Gwebu should stop ill-treating him in this way because this means they are violating his rights as a citizen of this country," Methula said.

He warned the Mpolonjeni residents that it was dangerous for them to illtreat Gwebu just because he was disabled.

Situation

Anyone, Methula said, could possibly find himself in Gwebu's situation or even worse than his situation.

He said if the Mpolonjeni folks were behaving this way, then it meant they were not people who deserved to live in harmony with others in a normal society.


"They might think that they are better, but Gwebu is the real person than them because they are not protecting him like any other citizen living in this country," he said.

He promised to engage the area's royal kraal (umphakatsi) in the matter to make sure that Gwebu is treated with respect and protected in that

He promised to call the area's headman, Thangithini Mabuza and discuss the matter with him.

He said the Umphakatsi was the one that was supposed to take care of

Gwebu. He said if the umphakatsi was not taking responsibility in this case, then it meant the authorities of the area did not know what their responsibility was.

Authorities

The area's caregiver Glenrose
Dvuba-Dlamini said she was puzzled
by the fact that the authorities in
Mpolonjeni were suddenly playing
innocent in the matter.

"Thave been trying to deal with Gwebu's matter for many years.

Protection

"I have even formed a right to food group, where we tried to bring to the attention of the authorities the fact that having food is a socio-economic right that needed protection from the authorities, especially for a disabled person like Gwebu.

"I presented the document to umphakatsi, nothing happened," Dube-Dlamini said.

She said Gwebu was fined E3 000

for a cow that died in his field. The cow is said to have been injured when it was found dead in Gwebu's field.

"This happened around 2008 or 2009. Gwebu was accused of having injured the cow and he was taken to the Swazi National Court by it's

Representative

"The court fined him E3 000 and he is said to have paid the money, with the help of his family."

The care giver said she was saddened by the situation. She said she could not believe that the area's Chief's Representative (Mangwana) Jabu Hlophe said the situation had improved.

However, she said she respected her for taking action to better the situation.

"I respect her for doing what she did but the authorities could not support her and she gave up," she said.

Nhlangano court without water for a whole day

THE Nhlangano court building was on Tuesday left without water for almost the whole day following the upgrading of the Benguni Street.

On Tuesday, judiciary officers and other staff members from the justice ministry based in the region had no water.

"Water is life as the work we do require us to drink now and again. Court had to adjourn after I realised that there was no water and was not even aware when it will be restored. When such happens, you cannot use the toilets, for instance. We should have at least been alerted that there was to be disruption," said ta judiciary officer. Members of the public who had come to the courts for various reasons were also affected by the unavailability of water.

Those who wanted to use toilets were advised to go elsewhere "We should have at least been alerted that there will be such disruptions and we could have found other alternative such as filling the drums during the temporary disconnection," commented another staff member.



UNISWA student takes baby daddy to court over laptop

MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE (MR)

SWAZILAND has a generalized epidemic and identifies women and girls, the youth, sex workers, men who have sex with other men, prisoners and mobile populations as key populations at a higher risk of HIV infection.

Although it is acknowledged that injecting drug users exist, there is limited data on their size and contribution to new HIV infections.

The country has alarming HIV incidence rates of 4% for adolescent girls aged 18-19 years and young women aged 20-24 years (though among adolescent boys aged 18-19 years and young men aged 20-24 years, the HIV incidence is at 1%and 2%, respectively) as indicated by the Swaziland HIV Incidence Measurement Survey (SHIMS).

Despite this concerning statistics, the reality is that the country's youth still represents the collective hope for the future of the entire Swazi nation. Accepting this reality, the National Emergency Response Council on HIV and AIDS (NER-CHA) has taken leaf from Franklin D. Roosevelt who said, "We cannot always build the future for our youth, but we can build our youth for the future", and has for the past week, been consulting with young people from the country's four (4) regions with the aim of capturing their voices on what they believe can best address their needs towards ending AIDS by 2022. It is hoped that this will result in a better Swaziland.

Young people are at an increased risk for HIV exposure due in part to multiple transitions (for example, biological and psychological) and

developmental tasks (e.g. establishing identity) in their period of the life span. Among young people, there are also key populations (to those most likely to be exposed to HIV or to transmit it) that bear disproportionate burdens of HIV and AIDS and are the most vulnerable. Young key populations in Swaziland include mainly, men who have sex with men (MSM), sex workers, and those in correctional facilities. Young key populations are at an increased risk of HIV infection compared to adults, due to cognitive, contextual and structural

factors that increase their vulnera-

and exploitation or abuse by older

people.

bility to peer pressure, manipulation

Even though young key populations' behaviors in the country are stigmatised and illegal, NERCHA realizes that their engagement is critical to a successful HIV response as they are key to the epidemic and key to the response. It is for this reason that, as part of the regional youth consultations, NERCHA with the support of her partners convened a special session to solicit their inputs on Ending AIDS, and their unique role and needs for HIV prevention.

The global challenges of young **MSM**

■ They experience life stressors and high levels of victimisation based on sexual identity, that can lead to engagement in higher risk sexual and drug activities - which also makes practicing HIV prevention strategies challenging;

Compared to their heterosexual peer, young MSM have been found to have increased risk of depressive symptoms, anxiety disorders, suicidal indication and attempts;

■ Many experience homelessness or unstable housing as a result of being driven out of their family homes. Sometimes the situation extends to schools and institutions of higher learning, where MSM are stigmatised and even expelled for their sexual orientation;

■ Stigmatisation, discrimination and homophobia often leads to difficulty with developing a positive self-identity. Also, because their behaviors are pronounced as illegal, and therefore connote possible legal consequences (such as imprisonment) or fear of punishment, the result is that the young MSM often suffer harassment and delay access to services such as treatment and

The global challenges of young sex workers

■ Unprotected Sex – This is an important factor for negative health outcomes among young people and evidence shows that young age is associated with more frequent unprotected sex among young sex workers, often due to lower levels of education, knowledge and risk perceptions. Imbalance in relationship power hinders ability to negotiate safer sex, compounded by adolescent aspirations for love and pro-

Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) - The prevalence of STIs is also higher in younger

sex workers than in older ones. The Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) is a common STI that causes cervical cancer and other anogenital cancers.

Reproductive Health -Unintended pregnancies and therefore risks for both mother and baby, may lead to the termination of pregnancy (which is itself, illegal)

■ Sexual Assault – Young sex workers are likely to require sexual assault services, including access to pest exposure prophylaxis (PEP) as issues of violent rape are rampant.

■ Mental Health – The stigma, discrimination, social exclusion and victimisation experienced by young sex workers often substantially leads to cases of depression, suicide, and drug use.

■ Substance Use – Drug use and experimentation are common in adolescence, therefore young sex workers may initiate substance use to self-medicate against anxiety associated with group behaviors, or associated negative experiences. Substance use may increase sexual desire, lower inhibitions and repair decision-making.

Special Session on HIV prevention for young key populations in Swaziland

The special session held at the George hotel on Friday, 8th April provided a forum for the young key populations to lend their voice to Ending AIDS in the country. Among the many issues they submitted for consideration were:

The country has a general lack of commodities needed by key populations in order to practice their

prevention options, which unfortunately plays a major role in the spread of HIV. It was suggested that NERCHA facilitates the purchase of commodities such as flavored condoms, water based lubricants and dental dams to be distributed to the MSM community through their community based organisations that include: House of Our Pride, Rock of Hope and HealthPlus 4 Men.

■ There is also need to fast-track the introduction of the bio-medical prevention approach that is preexposure prophylaxis (PrEP);

■ There is need to ensure the availability of health information that is relevant to the needs of MSM community, including HIV testing services for MSM partners - where there is need to make the tools used for pre-testing accommodative of the MSM community by making the language user friendly.

There is need to pay closeattention to early childhood care and development as many children show at an early age, an inclination towards gender roles that are perceived to be reserved for the opposite sex, and most often, these children are ridiculed to an extent of making them withdrawn and thus marginalised.

As Kofi Annan said, "Young people should be at the forefront of global changes and innovation. Empowered, they can be agents for development and peace. If, however, they are left on society's margins, all of us will be impoverished. Let us ensure that all young people have every opportunity to participate fully in the lives of their societies."

It is hoped that the National HIV Prevention Indaba for Young People in Swaziland held on Wednesday 13 April, at the Royal Swazi Sun's Convention Centre will provide the catalyst for finally embracing young people's idiom of "nothing for us, without us" and lead to interventions that are informed by young people's stated needs, including young key populations.

IN a bid to empower local girls so they may avoid falling into the clutches of abuse, child marriages, teenage pregnancy, HIV and AIDS and many social ills that they have to contend with, Women and Law Southern Africa (Swaziland Chapter) in conjunction with the United States Ambassador's Community Grants on Adolescents has embarked on a year long youth empowerment pilot programme to be carried at Emhlangeni area, near Bhunya.

This programme will see the area's youth, especially girls actively taking part in a number of initiatives that will help inform, educate and as well as entertain them on the above mentioned issues and how they can steer clear from falling victims.

The programme that was recently launched at the area will also help increase the adolescents' awareness on health related human rights issues which include stigma and discrimination. It seeks to further ensure meaningful involvement and participation of adolescents in national HIV and AIDS policy formulation while also empowering them with education, knowledge and skills that will enable them to insist on safer sex, prevent unwanted pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections, including HIV.

The adolescents, during the programme will also debate and discuss in order to understand HIV and human rights policies and cultural practices that negatively affect them, while also creating campaigns and building community youth ambassadors for change leadership session at community

This is done in appreciation of the fact that an empowered youth is able to delay sex and can stand up against practices that may negatively affect their future like early marriages and gender abuse.

Using vehicles like art, music. poetry and other means to convey positive messages to their elders on how they feel about such scourges, the youths will also conduct sensitisation activities like silent marches at community level to show their disapproval of abuse and violence against children.

They will also strive to provide community HIV and human rights education, establish community girls clubs, for the protection and promotion of adolescents' human rights and access to information and services for treatment and pre-

vention of HIV and conduct listenership and viewership clubs on issues affecting adolescents.

All this is being done under the auspices of the US Ambassador's Community Grants programme on adolescents which is aimed at reducing the vulnerability of such sectors of the populace to HIV infection and its consequences.

It is further aimed at filling the gaps that are so manifest, especially in the country's laws that continuously treat women as second class citizens. Women are not fully protected in the country, despite the fact that the constitution clearly accords them equal status to their male counterparts.

Response

For example, currently there is are no laws that promote a right based response to the HIV epidemic, resulting in a lack of support for health interventions that can create a supportive environment for groups that are vulnerable and affected by HIV including adoles-

Furthermore, where policy reform has taken place, there are no enforcement and implementation mechanisms that seek to promote and protect human rights in relation to HIV and AIDS. As a result, there is then urgent need to immediately address the issue of human rights in the health care settings, stigma and discrimination and unequal access to care and support for adolescents.

It then becomes prurient that they (adolescents) are primarily educated about HIV related human rights and to actively raise awareness of such issues to ensure a better future for adolescents in the country.

Press reports in the country continue to highlight the rampant cases of abuse and violence meted out against women and girls in the

country despite many efforts to curb this scourge, and as a result, WILSA, through the vehicle of the Ambassador's grant has found it necessary that they empower girls at a relative young age to fully understand and comprehend such issues so they can stand up to perpetrators as they will be armed with knowledge and understanding of their rights.

Issues

In this manner, they can report such issues even before they even take place to relevant structures which can then ensure that they get justice while the perpetrators are put in their rightful places.

For example, WILSA has established a wide network of paralegals in the country's four regions while also founding community girls clubs that work to promote and protect the rights of young girls. These initiatives are instrumental in reporting child abuse happening in the communities and the paralegals then link WLSA to such cases.

Through working with the paralegals, the young girls are educated on gender based violence and child abuse. The paralegals also work with families to ensure that the rights of girls are protected and fulfilled.

During the launch of the project, WLSA appealed to parents to release their adolescent children to partake in such activities as they were intended to ensure that they grow up to be empowered and informed citizens, and as a result can ably negotiate or even demand their rights among them safer sex, resistance to spousal abuse and many other issues that currently put women at a disadvantage.

"But most importantly, such activities have a big role to play in the development of the community as a community that is free from

abuse and violence can thrive and even attract economic benefits for itself. As parents, we should ask ourselves what role we played if our children grow up to become abusers.

"We must ensure that children achieve their full potential and do not grow up to be wayward citizens. You can play this role by allowing the children to take part in such initiatives as they are for the betterment of their future," WLSA Director Xolani Hlatshwayo said.

She observed that these and so many other similar activities had a great potential to alleviate social ills like unemployment, HIV and AIDS, the tibi tendlu syndrome and many others which have held the country backwards denying it of so many opportunities.

"As WLSA, we hope we will get your support in helping the children who are the future of this country to grow up and become respectable citizens that will neither condone nor practice gender abuse and violence against women and girls," she said.

Initiatives

She said such an initiative was not only targeting school going children, but even those who were out of school after having completed and were awaiting opportunities to further their education. She also noted that the local umphakatsi, when it was informed about the project stressed the importance of seeing whatever that was taught being practiced in the wider community, adding that they fully embraced the project and acknowledged its importance.

"But most of all, such an initiative will strive to nurture independent women who will stand up for themselves even when they have lost their spouses. Women who will bring up children that will respect gender equity and rid the community of stigma, discrimination and other social ills which have since taken root in our soci-

We believe there is no better way than to spread this gospel among our adolescents so they can grow up having fully embraced it and fully practice what they have learnt even during adulthood," she said.

The project is aimed at children from 10 to 18 years of age even though those who are above that but are still not employed are also welcome as there will also be an economical empowerment component in the year long programme.

LIBERIAN TEACHERS THREATEN STRIKE OVER PROPOSED PROGRAMME

Liberian school teachers are now threatening a nationwide strike if their government goes ahead with a proposed public-private education partnership

A battle is shaping up in the West African nation of Liberia over a proposed overhaul of the education system that the nation's teachers union has rejected.

Liberian school teachers are now threatening a nationwide strike if their government goes ahead with a proposed public-private education partnership. Samuel Johnson, senior secretary general of the National Teachers Association of Liberia says the teachers approved the strike resolution on Tuesday.

The government has signed a memorandum of understanding with Bridge International Academies, a low-cost nursery and primary private schools system that uses a technology-based approach to provide standardized education to students in developing countries.

Poor student performance

Liberia's education minister, George Werner, told VOA the government is not privatizing the nation's public education system. Rather he said it is entering into a public-private partnership for education because the current poor performance level of Liberian schools requires drastic action.

But Johnson said the proposed partnership is not feasible, sustainable, and it violates Liberia's constitution and education laws.

Lack of high tech infrastructure

"Based on our research, we told him [Mr. Werner] that it was not feasible to have this Bridge International Academies come teach children using digital tablets.

Less than three percent of our population in Liberia has access to electricity. Also, we don't have Internet facilities in most of our schools. Kenya has a more advanced technology than us. They have 24-



"The statistics are grim for us; we do not have sufficient trained and qualified teachers; our teacher attendance is poor, and the learning outcome for every student is dismal. So what we are trying to do is to leverage the best of the private sector in terms of management systems and accountability and governance to improve all of these elements and accelerate learning outcomes for our children wherever they are" Werner said.

hour electricity and yet Bridge International Academies is under performing there," Johnson said.

Werner disagrees and says Liberia has the institutional set up for this technology-based type of learning.

"There are many parts of the country, from Maryland to Montserrado, to Grand Gedeh, Nimba, and Lofa, and Cape Mount where we have Internet connectivity. We haven't covered the country in full, but we are well on our way to doing so," Werner said.

Low graduation rate

About 1.5 million children are enrolled in primary school in Liberia, but the government said only 20 percent of the children complete 12th grade. Liberia's protracted civil war in the 1990s has also taken its toll on the nation's education system. In 2013, nearly 25,000 students failed the University of Liberia entrance exams.

Education Minister Werner said the government cannot continue to have students trapped in schools that are not working for them.

working for them.

"The statistics are grim for us; we do not have sufficient trained and qualified teachers; our teacher attendance is poor, and the learning outcome for every student is dismal. So what we are trying to do is to leverage the best of the private sector in terms of management systems and accountabil-

ity and governance to improve all of these elements and accelerate learning outcomes for our children wherever they are," Werner said.

Teachers want more support

But Johnson said Liberia cannot continue to run its school system on a trial and error basis. He said there's no plan for sustainability of the partnership after the five-years being proposed for the pilot project. In addition, Johnson said the Ellen Johnson Sirleaf government is slated to leave office in two years.

Johnson rejected criticism that teachers are resisting change and that they are partly to blame for the underperforming of Liberia school children. He said the problem is the lack of training and equipment and general overall funding for the current education system.

"Right now there are no textbooks in most of the schools. The very University of Liberia that is supposed to be training teachers to go and teach at the high school level, the labs are not equipped; the majority of our high schools do not have access to laboratory for students to be able to do research; biology, chemistry, and physics teachers find it very difficult. This is why most of the students are failing. But they are trying to deviate and find scapegoats, us," Johnson said.

Pilot program The pilot project will start

with about 50 schools. Teacher's lesson guide subject areas include: English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, and Moral Education, according to the Memorandum of Understanding. Each teacher will be supplied with an ereader tablet running Bridge's suite of operating systems and applications to which all lessons and the teacher resource library will be published.

But Johnson said the teachers have asked the national legislature to stop the education minister from implementing this project.

"We have taken the issue to the national legislature because it's a violation of our constitution, Article 6, and the education laws. We are waiting for reaction from the national legislature."

Johnson said the National Teachers Association of Liberia will call for a nation-wide strike if the education minister continues to push for implementation of the public-private partnership in education.

"If he does not listen, that's the next option. There will be a nationwide strike if they continue to impose something that we know is the feasible, not sustainable, and it is a violation of our constitution and education laws," Johnson said.

SD reserves drop by 3.1% to E8.5 bi

THE country's gross official reserves decreased by 3.1 percent from E8.8 billion in February 2016 to E8.5 billion at the end of March, 2016.

The Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) attributed the decrease to payment of government's budgetary obligations.

Foreign exchange reserves are an important indicator of a country's ability to repay foreign debt in the short term and are used for currency defence. Reserves are also one of the factors used to determine a country's credit rating.

According to the CBS monthly statistical release the reserves were enough to cover an estimated 3.8 months of imports, slightly below the 3.9 months observed in February 2016, but somewhat higher than the 3.5 months

observed in the same month last

"When valued in special drawing rights, reserves amounted to SDR409.6 million reflecting a month on month increase of 3.1 percent, but they were 15.1 percent lower than recorded in March 2015," reads the report.

As of March 2016, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) had created and allocated to its members 204.1 billion SDRs, which was equivalent to about E4 218 billion (\$285 billion).

Reserves

In January 2016, the CBS reported that the country's gross domestic reserves amounted to about E9.4 billion, saying that at this level the gross official reserves were enough to cover 4.2 months of estimated imports.

This means that between January and March 2016, gross official reserves decreased from

E9.4 billion to 8.5 billion, which is almost E1 billion.

Meanwhile, the CBS reported that credit to businesses amounted to E5.1 billion, 3.8 percent lower than in January 2016, and 9.7 percent lower than in February 2016.

Reflected

"The mostly fall in credit to businesses was mainly reflected in the manufacturing sector (largely sugar and molasses as well as textiles and wearing apparels sub-sectors) which contracted by 24.2 percent," reads the report as part.

Other sectors which depicted a slow down included mining and quarrying, at -4.3 percent, real estate -3.9 percent, community social and personal services -3.6 percent, as well as construction -3.3 percent.

However, according to the report credit to the transport and communications as well as the

distribution and tourism sectors reflected growth of eight percent and 2.9 percent respectively.

The report said broad money supply or demand deposits at commercial banks, and any monies held in easily accessible accounts amounted to about E13 billion, which was 2.7 percent lower than in February 2016, but 14.2 percent higher than in the same month in 2015.

The growth of money supply is an important factor not only for acceleration of economic development, but also for price stability in the economy.

Thus, increase in money supply affected vitally the rate of economic growth. In fact it was now regarded as a legitimate instrument of economic growth, kept within proper limits it could accelerate economic growth, but exceeding of the limits might retard it.

SEDCO fruit tree programme to enable circulation of about E73m

SMALL Enterprises Development Company Limited (SEDCO) has encouraged Swazi households to take up fruit tree growing as it is a very lucrative business that could benefit households.

Speaking during a seminar on the National Integrated Tinkhundla Fruit Tree Development Programme held vesterday at Esibayeni Lodge, SEDCO Managing Director Dorrington Matiwane said the programme seeks to stimulate local production of fruit tree development currently satisfied through imports to the value of E73 million.


"Imagine what could happen if that E73 million was to circulate in the country instead of being used to purchase imports" he said.

The managing director said the goals of the programme were the creation of critical mass of fruits through promoting profitable smallholder orchards.

"To equip children in schools and under care of national care points and churches with skills on fruit production for self reliance," he said.

"To facilitate the diffusion and adoption of new technologies for the production of value added products from fruits," he added.

Matiwane said this in turn would unlock agricultural and other business opportunities that could be carried out at household

level and awaken the spirit of entrepreneurship in the Kingdom.

He said this programme lever-

aged on the fact that a majority of Swazi households have the potential to participate in fruit production.

The programme was launched in October 2014 and the resource mobilisation for the programme was launched by Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini in May 2015, as a result sponsorships to the equivalent of 6 250 fruit seedlings had since been secured from various anchor sponsors.

Matiwane said the programme promotes collective production and marketing through the cluster approach.

"The programme is partly government and partly sponsor funded, and so can be best understood as a multi-stakeholder driven initiative," he said.

He said the programme utilised readily available resources economically to make profit by leveraging the prospects for exporting and processing of fruits.

However, he said they faced a number of limitations on the implementation of the programme which included amongst others resource mobilisation.

"Limited resources is slowing down the pace of implementation, however we believe that resource mobilization through public private partnerships is the way forward to alleviating limited resources problems," he said.

He added that local capacity to supply high value seedlings was also a challenge; therefore he said they intended to create a business model for viable business nurseries and further build capacity for Swazis to venture into the project.



More than 200 entrants for 2015/16 Kickstart competition

SWAZILAND Beverages (SB) will next week announce the 60 finalists of the Kickstart competition who will receive training on putting together a business plan from over 200 entrants.

The eventual winners of the competition would be announced around July, 2016.

SB Corporate Affairs Officer Thandwa Dlamini said the company was thrilled to be contributing yet again to the establishment of innovative businesses that would boost the economy and life style of the nation.

ESWATINI KITCHEN CALLS FOR TOMATO SUPPLIERS

ESWATINI kitchen has opened new opportunity for farmers as the company requires a huge supply of gem tomatoes.

Gem or Roma tomatoes are a new hybrid popularly used both for canning and producing tomato paste because of their slender and firm nature.

The company's Procurement and Extension Manager Vusie Nkambule said the company required more of these tomatoes for their tomato sauce production

"We require those who produce those kinds of tomatoes to contact us," he said.

He said the current drought had resulted in a supply shortage of tomatoes in the country, their supply had also been strained.


Nkhambule invited farmers who had the tomatoes to contact them so as to make arrangements and also verify if their production met the required standards, since the company had passed a food safety certificate, the FSSC 22000 Food Safety System Certification which provided a framework for the effective management for food safety responsibilities.

"It is fully recognised by the Global Food Safety Initiative (GFSI) and is based on existing ISO Standards. It reflects company's or organization's robust Food Safety Management Systems that meets the requirements of customers and consumers," said Nkambule.

He said since they have attained the ISO certification they had to ensure that they get every produce from farmers that met the required standards.

"By engaging local farmers we also want to support local production and reduce importation," he said.

The company reportedly exports its products to about 15 international destinations including Europe, The United States of America (USA), Australia and Japan.

the company has been a good
market for honey bee farmers

"We will continue to provide trainings for bee farmers, which cover food safety where we will teach them on how they should handle their harvesting and keep their honey clean all at times," he said.

As the nearing winter season is normally the harvesting period for bee keepers, Nkhambule said all their systems were in place and ready to procure honey from local beekeepers.

He said their main market for honey was basically Japan,

where they required thousand tonnes of honey. However, he said their supply had been far below average to reach the required amount of honey.

"We urge beekeepers to come forward so that we can make arrangements on how we can work together," he said.

"We also want to have programs that would assist farmers to reach our requirement standards so that they can be able to sell their Honey to us," he added.

Nkambule said they will continue buying honey from farmers and provide them with clean white 20litres buckets so that farmers could use them to pack their harvested honey.

"By providing clean buckets we want to prevent contamination from the used containers where you find that the container had muck," he said.


There is need for policies that will promote wealth creation

MTN's Nhleko plans exit amid Nigeria fine optimism

CAPE TOWN - MTN [JSE:MTN] Group Executive Chair Phuthuma Nhleko, who returned to lead the African wireless company's negotiations over a record \$3.9bn fine in Nigeria, is moving forward with plans to step down in May, according to a person familiar with the matter, a sign he's confident a resolution will be reached by then.

Nhleko won't step away from his operational role until he comes to an agreement with the Nigerian attorney general, said the person, who asked not to be identified because the plans are private.

In November, the chair agreed to run MTN for six months in order to 'proactively deal' with Nigerian authorities after chief executive Sifiso Dabengwa resigned, Nhleko said at the time.

The plan for an on-time departure suggests an end is in sight for a murky, months-long crisis that's gutted the share value of Johannesburgbased MTN by one-third. Getting it solved has been the top priority of Nhleko, who ran MTN as CEO for almost nine years until 2011.

The company proposed a \$1.5bn package in March that included 150 billion naira (\$754m) in cash plus incentives. The Nigerian government hasn't formally responded, though some lawmakers have called for even bigger fines. The government hasn't taken a position on the MTN offer

and is still fielding responses from stakeholders, Abubakar Malami, Nigeria's minister of justice and attorney general, said at a parliament hearing on Tuesday.

Position

"No negotiation has taken place yet," Malami said. "We asked that MTN should put their position on paper, which they did, and we circulated to stakeholders."

MTN spokesperson Chris Maroleng declined to comment.

There's a shortlist of three candidates to become the new CEO, according to the person familiar with the matter. Two are from within MTN and one is external, the person said.

MTN was hit by the penalty in October for missing a government deadline to disconnect 5.1 million subscribers who were declared unregistered following a crackdown on security in the country.

The fine was later reduced by 25% from an original \$5.2bn. While the lower amount equates to almost three times MTN's 2015 net income, a spokesperson for the West African country's House of Representatives said in March the original levy should be doubled to \$10bn.

In its annual results issued on March 3, MTN said it was engaged with Nigerian authorities as it seeks an amicable resolution, and that traders in its securities should exer-

cise caution until the matter is resolved.

The company paid 50 billion naira to a government "recovery account" in February toward an eventual settlement, a payment that has been criticised by some lawmakers. The board plans to appoint a new group CEO in the second quarter.

No BRICS bank job for Nene after all

JOHANNESBURG - As applications for the job Nhlanhla Nene was promised appear to be closed, the fired former finance minister seems to have moved on.

Speaking to eNCA earlier this week, Nene revealed that he had taken a job in the private sector, but was keeping mum about the details

After being replaced by two ministers within a week last December by President Jacob Zuma, Nene was announced as South Africa's nominee to head the Africa regional centre for the Brics-operated New

Development Bank (NDB) in Johannesburg. Four months later, the bank has yet to announce whether the position has been filled. But Nene is waiting no longer. He told eNCA his 'gardening leave' would soon come to an end.

The EFF has accused Zuma of misleading the nation with regards to Nene's axing. "The EFF notes reports that former finance minister Nhlanhla Nene has accepted a job offer in the private sector as a clear indication that Zuma deliberately misled and deceived the nation," said the party.


"The president removed him, yet the country has learned that Nene will now be working in the private sector and not as head of the BRICS Bank, as Zuma explained."

This was, according to the EFF, a further demonstration that Zuma did not take his oath of office seriously and disregarded the intelligence of the people of South Africa.

Without an auditor, Oakbay faces being delisted

JOHANNESBURG - The Johannesburg Stock Exchange (JSE) is keeping 'a close eye' on Oakbay Investments to ensured it complies with legislation governing listed companies after KPMG has refused to audit the company in future

Brothers Atul and Varun Gupta were directors of Oakbay until they stepped down last Friday.

Auditors KPMG severed their relationship with Oakbay Investments as the risk of being associated with the company due to the controversy surrounding the Guptas was too great.

Reports have alleged that the brothers have held influence over politicians, and have been said to have offered ministerial positions.

As Oakbay is a listed company, it has to be audited annually in terms of JSE listing requirements and the Companies Act.

Andre Visser, general manager of Issuer Regulation at the JSE, said: Listed companies need the services of an auditor when they issue their annual financial statement once per annum and in certain cases for interim and provisional financial statements. "This ensures that the information is reliable to assist investors make informed investment decisions." Without annual audits, the JSE would be

legally obliged to delist them from the exchange, he explained. It is unclear if Oakbay has been able to find new auditors as its CEO, Nazeem Howa, had not responded to queries. Visser said: "The JSE is keeping a close eye on the Oakbay group's compliance with the listings requirements and will ensure that the appropriate announcements are made." Three banks have also stopped offering services to the Guptas and their companies. Asked if it would consider reopening banking accounts with Oakbay Investments following the brothers' resignations, FNB remained mum. TMG Digital/The Times

SA households getting poorer, may become govt's problem

JOHANNEBSURG - South African households are poorer than they were two years ago and if the economic conditions remain difficult, the middle class might be forced to seek assistance from government.

A study done by Momentum and the University of South Africa (UNISA) showed that the real net wealth of local households in 2015 has decreased by R6 302 to R386 115 since 2013.

"This was mainly due to a decline in real assets per household (that decreased to an estimated R466 948 in 2015 from R480 558 at the end of 2014) and an increase in the number of households," read the study released yesterday.

"Momentum/UNISA estimates that real household net wealth decreased to R6.287-trillion in the fourth quarter of 2015 – this is R45.1-billion lower than a year before in quarter four of 2014.

"This decrease means that real household net wealth contracted in three of the four quarters of 2015 – and ended the year at a level just above that registered in quarter one of 2014"

According to the study, the decline meant that households needed to continue cutting their expenses. Households would also be forced to review their future lifestyle expectations by adjusting their saving and retirement targets, it was recommended. TMG Digital/Sowetan

MMM: PYRAMID SCHEME, STOKVEL OR WEALTH REVOLUTION?

CAPE TOWN - If MMM Global SA is a stokyel and not a pyramid scheme, as claimed by some of its members on Tuesday, then it needs to be a member of the National Stokyel Association of South Africa (NASASA) or a similar body and conform to its rules.

That's the message from the National Consumer Commission's (NCC) Trevor Hattingh, who investigated the alleged pyramid scheme in

"In 2015 the NCC conducted an assessment of the business models and practices of MMM together with that of eight other savings or investment schemes," Hattingh told Fin24. "The purpose of this assessment was to establish if any of the schemes were contravening the provisions of the Consumer Protection Act.

"The NCC has been working with the South African Police Service on this matter and therefore on completion of its initial role (assessment), handed it over to the SAPS (Hawks) for further assessment."

"We found something, but we're not going to disclose that," he told the Cape Times. "We're still working with the Hawks."

"There is an inquiry that has been opened," said Hawks spokesperson Hangwani Mulaudzi, according to the Cape Times on Wednesday. "We're having a slight challenge in the fact that the scheme is being run through the internet.

"We've enlisted the help of the (police's) cybercrimes unit and the Financial Intelligence Centre. Another challenge is that we have not received any complaints from the investors. We want to encourage them to come forward."

After news emerged that MMM Global's Republic of Bitcoin collapsed over the weekend, the South African wing of MMM said its system is not a Ponzi or pyramid scheme and is not affected by the

The SA platform said its members are encouraged to donate money to others by rewarding them with the bitcoin-linked virtual currency, mavros, in return, which they can withdraw in rands. They can apparently get 30% return on their rand investment by doing so. According

to a City Press report on Sunday on MMM, the Consumer Protection Act describes a pyramid scheme as any business model that promises an investor an annual interest rate of 20% above the repo rate, which is currently at 7%.

MMM Global SA participant M Makgato told Fin24 on Tuesday that MMM "is not an investment, it's a stokvel where people donate money to each other.

There's no day where (Russian MMM founder Sergey) Mavrodi gets access to the money because the money is within the members."

Another local MMM member N Zondi wrote: "MMM has never been an investment and is 100% transparent to place it as a strong WARN-ING on every of its websites that it is NOT an investment. MMM solely is a donation platform whose success/failure relies solely on its partic-

ipants providing and getting help from themselves.

"In MMM, we say THERE ARE NO GUARANTEES. But no one will join you if they know they will get nothing back in return.

Box where people save their money

MMM SA said 'it's a kind of common storage box where people save their money and then take it when needed'.

"There is no central account, where all the system money flows to ... All the money is only on the banking accounts of the participants themselves!"

As MMM is strongly opposed to conventional banking and regulations, it is unlikely it can fall under a stokvel. So if it's not a stokvel, then what is it?

According to Financial Times journalist Izabella Kaminska, "in its previous incarnations, the

MMM scheme depended on its own parallel currency, the mavros, for storing and clearing value. The latest MMM Global scheme (which collapsed on the weekend), however, turned to bitcoin for both payments processing and value preservation. Mavrodi has in the past claimed that the MMM scheme has been

a key influencer of the bitcoin price. So far the price of bitcoin appears to be unaffected."

City Press consumer journalist Maya Fisher-French said that, based on the information provided on the website, MMM Global SA follows a classic pyramid structure.

"The participants (of MMM SA) derive their income or returns primarily for the recruitment of new members.

"President Zuma has been running from the Nkandla saga for the better part of five years, dodging accountability, and refusing the take responsibility for the fact the he unduly benefitted from public money to the tune of R250-million," Maimane said.

"While the African National Congress constantly protect this one man from accountability, I am committed to ensuring that no person can be above the law at the expense of the South African people, whether that be the president or not. News24

Motsoeneng has since reportedly said he was unaware of the person purporting to be his

The CRL reportedly said that reports circulating on social media about pictures of him in heaven were blasphemous and brought Christianity into disrepute. CRL Rights Commission chairperson, Thoko Mkhwanazi-Xaluva, said

JAKARTA - An Indonesian teenager suffering from a rare condition known as 'Werewolf Syndrome' has rejected medical treatment and says villagers revere him as a Hindu God.

Muhammad Raihan, 13, is covered in hair up to three inches long across all parts of his body, including his face and back.

But the student, who also faces name-calling from some peers who liken him to Hindu monkey god Hanuman, claims it is a blessing from God.

Muhammad Raihan, 13, suffers from a condition known as 'Werewolf Syndrome' which sees him covered with an unusual amount of hair.

The devout Muslim from Indonesia claims his appearance is a blessing from God and refuses to be medicated.

He says some in the village laugh at him, but many others consider him a god and ask to be given a blessing.

The devout Muslim, who lives with his widowed mum and four siblings in Mamburung village in North Kalimantan, said: "I am not bothered with such attention - some people laugh at me, others just come to me for a blessing.

"Sometime people would flock to my house from far-off villages to just have a glimpse of me. They think I am a god or have special powers, but this attention is okay because I know I look different."

His mother Pardan, who lost her husband Muslihah 10 months ago, took him to several doctors but she stopped medication after they said his hair would only grow longer and thicker with age.

Pardan has instead instilled confi-

dence and faith in God in Raihan.

And for Raihan, who shares a room with his unaffected siblings, he feels blessed to have a distinct appearance



Namibia deports 32 Zimbabweans

WINDHOEK - Namibia has deported 32 Zimbabwean nationals who were arrested for offences which include illegal entry and working illegally in the country. The 32 were transported from Katima Mulilo to the Zimbabwean resort town of Victoria Falls by the Namibian Ministry of Home Affairs. They were immediately arrested on arrival by Zimbabwean authorities and slapped with a common charge of exiting the country illegally through ungazetted points. TAIPEI - Kenyan police broke through a police station wall and threw tear gas to force a second group of Taiwanese on to a plane bound for China on Tuesday, Taiwan's foreign ministry said, in a bizarre diplomatic row in which Taiwan has accused China of abduction. But a senior Kenyan official said the people were in Kenya illegally and were being sent back to where they had come from Taiwan on Monday accused China, which regards the self-ruled island as a breakaway province, of kidnapping eight of its nationals, who it said had been acquitted in a cyber crime case in Kenya. In the meeting of police chiefs in Cameroon's capital Yaounde last Friday (08.04.2016), it was revealed that thousands of women, children and men were trafficked from Cameroon, Central African Republic (CAR), Gabon, Democratic Republic of Congo(DRC) and Equatorial Guinea. Lawrence Oben Enow, confirmed that the victims were later turned into combatants, sex slaves and spies for the Islamist group.

"Women and children are either sold to rebels in the Central African Republic and Boko Haram terrorists in northern Cameroon or forced to join them," Enow said.

The United Nations Central Emergency Response Fund (CERF), said in December 2015 that Boko Haram related violence across the Lake Chad Basin has led to the increased number of refugees in the region.

At least 75 000 worst affected Nigerians are still hosted in Cameroon's Far North region and 82 000 internally displaced people affected by the spillover of the conflict to Cameroon since 2013.

The UN's children education fund UNICEF says more than 1 million children in northeastern Nigeria and its neighbouring countries cannot attend school due to insurgency. *All Africa*

Girls in Nigeria are becoming killers

ABUJA - Girls captured by Boko Haram in Nigeria are volunteering to become suicide bombers because they can no longer bear the sexual abuse and constant hunger they suffer as prisoners.

Many of the young women take the shocking decision as a last resort to try and escape the jihadi group, even if it costs them their life.

Women who managed to escape Boko Haram have revealed that the young bombers don't believe in the radical ideology of the group but rather they want to run away from the nightmare conditions.

They would ask, "Who wants to be a suicide bomber?" The girls would shout, 'me, me, me.' They were fighting to do the suicide bombings,' Fati, a survivor of

Boko Haram, told CNN.

Fati said the militants turned up at her village, demanding to take the young girls to marry them off to their fighters. When the girls said they were too young, they were seized by force.

She said some of the young girls living in Boko Haram's base in the Sambisa forest were from the large group of schoolgirls taken from Chibok.

She recalled the terrifying conditions inside the camps, which were regularly attacked by the Nigerian army, forcing the Islamists to move on a regular basis.

Boko Haram child suicide bombings have surged 11-fold in West Africa over the last year, with children as young as 8, mostly girls, detonating bombs in schools and markets.

Suicide bombings have spread beyond Nigeria's borders, with an increasing number of deadly attacks carried out by children with explosives hidden under their clothes or in baskets.

"The use of children, especially girls, as so-called suicide bombers has become a defining and alarming feature of this conflict," said Laurent Duvillier, regional spokesman for UNICEF.

"It's basically turning the children against their own communities by strapping bombs around their bodies," he said. *Daily Mail*

Broken Paris bomber on suicide watch

PARIS - The first photograph of captured Paris ISIS attacker Salah Abdeslam has emerged showing the failed suicide bomber looking bearded and broken inside a prison in Bruges.

The terrorist has been described as a "model prisoner" and that guards have been checking on him eight times an hour for fear he might try to harm himself, according to local media Nieuwsblad who quoted a prison source and an investigation report on his reaction to life in prison.

Abdeslam is believed to have played a key role in the logistics of the Paris attacks, hiring the cars and renting the safe houses for the other members of the ISIS cell.

The former bar owner, whose brother Brahim blew himself up in a coffee shop in Paris, has grown a straggly beard and looks far from the preened image of his wanted poster. His face appears swollen and tired, with heavily dark bags underneath his eyes.

Abdeslam is thought to have grown a beard to disguise his clean cut appearance whilst he was on the run from the authorities for four months after the attacks in Paris, which left 130 people dead. Belgian media have quoted an intelligence report on Abdeslam which allegedly describes the prisoner as 'a very good boy' and 'an example for many other detainees in terms of behaviour.' "We do not have to report any negative comment about his doings. And his appetite is excellent," according to Nieuwsblad. The 26-year-old appeared to have changed his mind at the last minute on the night of the attack, choosing to dump his suicide vest and flee over the border to Belgium. Despite an international manhunt for the wanted jihadi, Abdeslam evaded security services until he was shot in the leg and arrested on 18 March. He had been tracked down to the Brussels' district of Molenbeek, where it is thought several of the terror cell had been living before they went to Syria.

Mohammed Abrini, Abdeslam's accomplice who helped drive him over the border, was arrested last week in Belgium.

He has reportedly admitted to being 'the man in white' who was filmed at Brussels airport walking alongside the two suicide bombers Najim Laachraou and Ibrahim El Bakraoui. *Daily Mail*

...to take top job at United Nations when Ban Ki-moon steps down at the end of this year

KREMLIN - A former communist backed by Vladimir Putin has become the frontrunner to take over the United Nations as its first ever woman chief.

Irina Bokova, a Bulgarian who was educated in Moscow and is said to be a 'darling' of Putin, hopes to succeed Ban Ki-moon when he steps down at the end of this year.

However, the Daily Mail has obtained documents reflecting grave concern about her capacity to handle such an important job.

British diplomats have even demanded a fraud inquiry into an appointment made by the 63-year-old UNESCO chief.

The UK ambassador to the UN cultural body took the extraordinary step after Bokova tried to install an alleged crony as a deputy.

Leaked minutes of a private session of the Unesco board

reveal that Matthew Sudders launched a withering attack – sanctioned by Whitehall – on Bokova's decision to make Ana Luiza Thompson-Flores, an 'under-qualified' Brazilian civil servant, her assistant director-general for strategic planning.

Critics viewed it as a ploy to secure Brazilian support for Mrs Bokova's campaign for the UN job. The British ambassador cited a suspicious embellishment of Thompson-Flores's CV and a job advert that was mysteriously rewritten to lower the post's criteria. At the meeting last April at Unesco's Paris HQ, Sudders declared: "As a UK civil servant, I have a duty to report all cases of possible or suspected fraud to our investigations department."

Saudi Arabia has money troubles

RIYADH -Saudi Arabia's longterm credit rating has been lowered with the plunge in oil prices having 'major negative implications' for the world's biggest crude exporter, according to Fitch Ratings.

The agency also noted increased tensions with long-time rival Iran and greater uncertainty over economic policy, now overseen by Deputy Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman. Fitch downgraded the kingdom's credit rating to AA-from AA, which still denotes expectations of very low default risk. Fitch said it had revised

downwards its oil price assumptions for this year and next, to \$35 and \$45 a barrel, which 'has major negative implications for Saudi Arabia's fiscal and external balances'. In February another agency, Standard and Poor's, cut the kingdom's credit rating by two notches to A-, citing the impact of lower oil prices on Saudi finances.

Last month, Moody's placed Saudi Arabia and other Gulf oil producers on review for down-

Trump, Clinton in a statistical dead heat

NEW YORK - A new poll from NBC News shows a highly competitive race between frontrunners Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton come November.

In a head-to-head match-up, the new NBC News/SurveyMonkey Weekly Election Tracking poll shows Clinton with 38 percent support and Trump with 36 percent support from registered voters, for a difference of two, which is just slightly outside the poll's error estimate of plus or minus 1.3 percent

Another 16 percent would prefer to vote for a third-party candidate, while 8 percent would stay home.

Sen. Ted Cruz, who has the second-most amount of delegates on the Republican side, is also competitive against Clinton, though the race isn't nearly as tight.

In a hypothetical Clinton-Cruz match-up, the Texas senator receives 32 percent, while Clinton scores five points higher at 37 percent. Additionally, another 19 percent would vote for a third-party candidate, while 10 percent would sit at home on Election Day.

The poll showcased the divisive nature of the GOP primary, which is likely to be settled at a contested convention in Cleveland in July.

Judge rules against gay couple

CHANGSHA - A judge yesterday ruled against a gay couple in China's first same-sex marriage case that was seen as a landmark moment for the country's emerging LGBT rights movement. The court in the central city of Changsha dismissed the suit brought against the local civil affairs bureau for refusing to issue the couple a marriage registration certificate. Their lawyer Shi Funong said he expected the judge would rule against them but not so soon, within just a few hours. "It goes against the spirit of the laws of the people's republic of China," Shi said. Afp

ISIS ranks at lowest level since 2014

washington - The Islamic State group's ranks have been pared back by international and local military action in Iraq and Syria to their lowest level since Washington began monitoring the group, a senior official said. "Working by, with and through local partners, we have taken back 40% of the territory that Daesh controlled a year ago in Iraq and 10% in Syria," deputy Secretary of State Antony Blinken told US lawmakers in prepared testimony." In fact, we assess Daesh's numbers are the lowest they've been since we began monitoring their manpower in 2014," he added. AFP

President under scrutiny

TEHRAN - The case presented by the Iranian judiciary was simple: In the southern province of Fars, Fatemeh Salbehi



suffocated her husband after drugging him, a capital crime in the Islamic Republic. What made the case controversial is that Salbehi was only 17, a minor by international legal standards, when she allegedly committed the crime. Her alleged confession also came during a series of interrogations where there was no lawyer present. The case was retried but Salbehi was hanged in the Adel Abad prison in Shiraz last October. *Reuters*

Airport evacuated after security threat

SCHIPHOL - Dozens of heavily-armed military police swooped on Amsterdam's Schiphol airport late Tuesday, evacuating part of the busy travel hub and arresting one man, triggering a four-hour security alert. The incident came as the Netherlands has been on high guard following the March 22 attack on the Brussels airport and metro in which 32 people were killed. "Police have evacuated part of the airport plaza and the adjacent Sheraton Hotel and arrested one person amid a suspicious situation," airport spokesperson Danielle Timmer told AFP. *Reuters*

19 passengers killed in bus accident

MULTAN - A head-on collision between a passenger bus and truck killed at least 19 passengers, including women and children, in Pakistan's eastern Punjab province on Wednesday, a rescue official said. Several people were also injured in the accident near the city of Faisalabad in Punjab province, said the official, Mohammad Naseem. "We have transported all the dead and injured to a hospital," he said, adding some of the injured were in critical condition. Naseem said the bus was apparently speeding at the time but officers were still investigating to determine the cause of the crash. TV footage showed images of the badly destroyed bus. Deadly accidents are common in Pakistan due to bad road infrastructure and a disregard of traffic laws. AP



Truth behind bars

THE Jail: 60 Days In – an unprecedented new, original 11-part docuseries following seven innocent participants who enter the dangerous world of incarceration at the Clark County Jail in Jeffersonville, Indiana, in an effort to expose internal issues and what really happens behind bars.

As a result of the facility's recent corrupt history, Sheriff Jamey Noel has devised a programme where the seven participants will live among the facility's general population for 60 days without officers, fellow inmates or staff knowing their secret. Around-the-clock cameras captured this unparalleled access in an effort to bring problems to light and give viewers a first-hand look as the participants adapt to unfamiliar and terrifying surroundings. The Jail: 60 Days In is a candid view of what life is like behind bars, through the eyes of people who have never been charged with a crime or done time.

"After recently taking office, it was no secret that the Clark County Jail had problems and we needed to take quick control. The only way to truly understand what was going on in the jail was to implement innocent participants into the system to provide first-hand unbiased intelligence.

"These brave volunteers helped us identify critical issues within our system that undercover officers would not have been able to find. We couldn't be more thrilled with the success of this inaugural programme," says Sheriff Jamey Noel.

Where is the prison situated?

Clark County Jail is a correctional facility in Jeffersonville, Indiana in the US. It houses approximately 500 inmates of both sexes. The prison is divided into different sections, or 'pods' as they are known. The participants in the experiment are in C Pod, which is known for its drug problems.

Why did it agree to host the 60 Days In experiment?

The jail is known for its corruption. Drug dealing is rampant and even the prison officers have been accused of crimes. Things have improved since the current sheriff, Jamey Noel, took over, but he understands that there's still plenty to be done, which is why he came up with the idea for the show and approached the producers. His predecessor, former Clark County Sheriff Danny Rodden, was arrested for hiring a prostitute and lying to federal investigators about it. How were the seven volunteers selected? 60 Days In executive producer Brad Holcman reveals

They were chosen for their individual journeys and what they brought to the table to get a very diverse look about what's happening in jail. Maryum (the eldest daughter of boxing great Muhammad Ali) is a social worker and she wanted to help children avoid incarceration. We had Zack, who is going to have a career in law enforcement, specifically within drug enforcement. And then you have Tammy, who is a police officer, who always had locked up people, but never knew what it was like behind bars after she dropped them off, and she wanted to know what it was like herself.

Isaiah wants to better relate to his older brother, who is currently in prison. Barbra is a military wife with two young children who strongly feels that inmates have it easy behind bars and that taxpayers foot the bill providing them with three square meals a day and a place to sleep, while innocent homeless people struggle to survive with little help. Robert is a teacher who wants to use this experience to show his students the ramifications of their choices so they don't end up behind

bars. Lastly, there's Jeff who wants to become a correctional officer, but also has questions about the system and how well it works. He believes not all felons are bad and hopes this experience will open his eyes to the reality of working in corrections.



The show has stimulated debate around the world while also providing gripping viewing. It has been so well received that a second season with new volunteers is already in production.

MADRID - Cristiano Ronaldo's hat-trick against Wolfsburg on Tuesday helped Real Madrid overcome a 2-0 deficit and singlehandedly earned his side a spot in the Champions League semifinals.

Remarkably, it was his sixth hattrick this season and the 37th of the Portuguese forward's dazzling career at Real Madrid.

The 31-year-old is an unstoppable as ever and the statistics behind his success are incredible.

His first hat-trick for Madrid was against Mallorca in La Liga in May 2010 and he has repeated the feat on another 36 occasions.

Hat-tricks

To put that into perspective, Alan Shearer has scored more hat-tricks in the Premier League than any other player - with a total of 11. Robbie Fowler has nine and Thierry Henry and Michael Owen are next on the list with eight.

PARIS - French newspaper L'Equipe have slammed Paris Saint-Germain's Champions League quarter-final exit on Tuesday following a 3-2 aggregate defeat against Manchester City.

Kevin De Bruyne's winning strike 14 minutes from time saw City edge the second leg at the Etihad Stadium following a 2-2 draw at the Parc des Princes a week ago. The result saw Manuel Pellegrini's side reach the semifinals for the first time, condemning the Ligue 1 champions to a fourth consecutive last eight exit and sparking anger in France.

The newspapers in France hit out at Laurent Blanc's side on Wednesday, with L'Equipe labeling the 1-0 second leg defeat by Manchester City a 'fiasco.'

Zlatan Ibrahimvoic admits his team-mates 'gave it away' over both legs and has blamed a new tactical approach for the defeat. Blanc lined his side up in a 3-5-2 formation but they were unable to find a way through City's resolute defence on Tuesday night.

Meyiwa's children benefit from PSL insurance policy

JOHANNESBURG - The Premier Soccer League yesterday announced the payment of a R4 million life policy on murdered Bafana Bafana and Orlando Pirates captain Senzo Meyiwa.

In terms of the policy, half the amount will be paid to the club, and half to the Meyiwa family, said PSL and Pirates Chairman Irvin Khoza.

He told a news conference in Johannesburg, in the presence of Meyiwa's father Sam, that the policy pay-out closes one chapter in the saga, but the resolution of the ongoing police investigation into the goalkeeper's killing is another needs urgent attention.

"I think it's nice to ease the pain of the family and also to deal with the speculations around this matter [the policy]," Khoza said.

"But what is important to me is not the money. What is important is that the murder of Senzo must

"It's important for justice in South Africa, for the confidence of this country." Meyiwa was shot dead at the house of former girlfriend Kelly Khumalo in Vosloorus on October 26, 2014. Two armed men entered the house and an altercation broke out that Meyiwa reportedly intervened in.

The footballer had a daughter with wife Mandisa Mkhize, and daughter with his mistress, Khumalo. Former SAFA CEO Raymond Hack, the administrator for the policy, said the payout to the family is directed at Meyiwa's children.

Meyiwa family representative Siyabonga Meyiwa said part of the pay-out will be made available to the daughter Senzo Meyiwa had with Khumalo.

"We have made all the efforts to make sure Kelly's child is also involved as a beneficiary, and that's the intention going forward," Siyabonga Meyiwa said.

"As a family we are also making moves to meet with her."


ANYTHING IS POSSIBLE -CAPTAIN MVUBU







ZIFA match-fixing scandal investigations dealt a blow

SOCCER - THE ongoing investigation on the Sihlangu, Warriors match-fixing scandal has hits a snag as a former ZIFA CEO has refused to cooperate with the football mother body.

ZIFA alleges that the former, CEO Henrietta Rushwaya, was the central figure in a plan to manipulate Warriors' defeats in their two AFCON qualifiers matches against Swaziland last month, a tie that was eventually won by the Zimbabwean side after winning one game and drawing the other.

Information sourced from one

of the Zimbabwean publications is that Rushwaya had declined to co-operate in the match-fixing investigation. wherein she is accused of plotting to manipulate the outcome Warriors' Africa Cup of Nations (AFCON) 2017 qualifiers against Swaziland, among other allegations.

ZIFA is said to have charged Rushwaya, together with the mother body's former programmes officer, Jonathan Musavengana, former Warriors coach Ian Gorowa, player agent Kudzi Shaba, Hwange coach Nation Dube and Edzai Kasinauyo, who was recently relived of his duties as an executive committee member in that country's supreme football

She responded by saying she would not be dragged to any disciplinary hearing by ZIFA, as she was no longer employed by the association.

Rushwaya, through her attorneys, has challenged ZIFA to instead charge its CEO. Jonathan Mashingaidze with corruption.

Case

Rushwaya was categorical that she would not attend any disciplinary hearing.

ZIFA is reported to have since made a police report over the corruption allegations, but none of the accused have been ques-

tioned.

Sports Minister Makhosini Hlongwane has since called for the arrest of those implicated in the scandal.

Office Rushwaya was implicated in the

Asiagate scandal. where she was accused of being the mastermind in fixing the Warriors matches in Asia.

The case

collapsed following ZIFA's failure to follow its disciplinary codes when they hired an independent body to conduct investigations.

Rushwaya then received a life ban from football, which was lifted in January, after the Philip Chiyangwa-led executive committee, assumed office.


The former striker said he would not forget Shongwe, whom he said played a role in making him an ambassador for the Reebok brand.

FATO INVESTIGATE MATCH-FIXING REPORT

- The leagues is left with three games - Football mother body against such practices

SOCCER - THE National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) has promised to lodge an investigation into the match-fixing reports in local football.

This follows reports by some of the teams in which they are accusing another premier league side of approaching them to sell to them an upcoming clash between the two sides.

Interviewed on this matter yesterday, NFAS CEO Frederick Mngomezulu said they were shocked to learn that could be happening in local football.

"We were shocked to learn of these match-fixing reports and will follow it up. Yes it is the PLS that manages games and they are better placed to determine what it going on. However, match-fixing is a serious allegation and as the football association we need to follow this matter up," he said.

The CEO said they had an Ethics Committee in place that had been educated to deal with such. "We already have the structures to deal with match fixing and corruption related matters in our football. The committee has been educated by FIFA on how to determine elements

that constitute match fixing," he

He said the association's objective was to ensure that all competitions were fair and free from match-fixing.

"We will seriously look into it and then act if need be. This will not be the first time as we once initiated a probe in 2006/07 after our referees were said to be involved in malpractices. We dealt with that matter then and we can deal with it now," he said.

The MTN Premier League is left with three days before the curtains fall.



'...Give match-fixers a life ban'

SOCCER - FOOTBALL supporters have called for the banning of any team found guilty of match-fixing in the country.

Interviewed on this matter yesterday, some of the supporters said they were disappointed to learn that there were teams conducting themselves in this

"This is really bad for our football. How can we expect to have teams that are desperate to win by buying and selling games playing in our league?

Such teams don't deserve to be here because it shows they have no integrity. They need to be banned for life," said Sabelo Dlamini.

Disturbed

Another supporter Sidumo Hlophe said he was disturbed to learn of such in local football.

"I thought such things happen in other countries and not in Swaziland. It would be really painful if these reports are true because it will really destroy our football," he said.

Meanwhile, Vusi Maseko said

he was expecting such to happen seeing that the league was nearing the end.

"I have always told myself that such things happen. It is just that it is not put out in the open like it has been now. The league is very interesting now and teams want to win it at the end. Others will, therefore, try to solicit points in every way possible in order to increase their chances of winning. This, however, is not to say it is good practice.

"I am totally against it as it is not good for the development of football," he added.

Other supporters took to social network where they blasted teams for acting in such a matter.

"This is a disgrace to local football. Teams should play and win fairly instead of going for illicit ways of achieving," they
