



17 MORE PROBLEMS FOR EMBATTLED SIPA CEO

EMBATTLED Chief Executive Officer of Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority (SIPA) Phumelele Dlamini has 17 more problems to solve with her staff.

This time added are grievances from cleaners based at the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre in Manzini.

Today the cleaners are sending a delegation to the chairman of the SIPA board of directors to explain the 17 grievances, one by one.

This takes the number of grievances against the CEO to 53 as managers and staffers from the head office had presented 36 problems of their own against the now controversial woman.

The cleaners say most issues were coming out of Mbabane yet they were equally affected, especially because since January 2014 they have been working as temporary staff, much against the Employment Act.


Having read media reports that a strike was imminent within SIPA ahead of the Swaziland International Trade Fair, the cleaners took particular response from the CEO denying the strike in a statement.

"All those grievances were and remain true and have even been added with the extra duties that have come with the Trade Fair," they say.

Interviewed yesterday during the lunch break, the cleaners revealed they had called Commerce and Trade Minister Gideon Dlamini in the morning for a follow-up having

reported to him at his homestead in Mliba before the Trade Fair whereby he had requested the cleaners to return to him after the event that terminated last week. However, since the end of the Trade Fair, the situation has instead deteriorated even after the minister had been made aware. They claim the minister had promised to invite a board member to hear first-hand the grievances and yesterday he allegedly promised them to call the chairman on their behalf.

Of note is that the complaints of the cleaners have similar traits with those of managers because they (cleaners) are not happy with the high-handedness of the CEO.

They are also not happy with alleged bullying of staff and further using derogatory words against employees.

The CEO has promised to hunt down all those who leaked information about SIPA.

She holds the view the matter was being attended to internally thus was alarmed how it found its way to the press. She said she would stop at nothing in finding who leaked the document detailing the problems at the investment company.

The board is said to have launched investigations into the matter.

Minister Dlamini confirmed knowledge of the staff concerns.

THE CLEANERS' 17 GRIEVANCES

The cleaners have prepared a list of grievances which they have also sent to the SIPA board of directors, the labour commissioner and the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

From 2014 January to 2016 no confirmation letters, only verbal confirmation directly by the CEO.

■ No salary increment since 2014-16. When we ask managers they say they will ask our human resources manager and come to address us, surprisingly the CEO came and asked us what we knew about cost of living (natini nge-cost of living).

■ On June22, 2016 the CEO came and told us that 31 October 2016 is our last day at SIPA and she will bring a company which will take over, saying this verbally with no written communication.

■ She will tell our managers that she wants to see us, without knowing the agenda of the meeting, and we will sometimes wait close to an hour after working hours before she arrives.

The last meeting with her she told us we will earn E1 400 as cost of living and E92 as increment for the past years, when we questioned her what was the rate and a written breakdown she boldly told us that her papers were not for advertisement emphasising she will give us the above amount saying she is not asking or expecting any objection from anyone.

■ On 19 August 2016 an in-contact of the E1 400 and the additional E92 to our basic salary without any written explanation went through.

■ No leave or leave pay since 2014 till now, 2016.

Our CEO gave us extra work which is not related to cleaners, e.g. painting and partitioning. When we asked her to give us something as appreciation, she threatened to fire us if we will not finish the work according to her expectations. As this job (partitioning) was done by a contractor in 2014 SITF, it earned close to a E1 million but she said we deserved nothing, only being fired if we fail to do or finish the work according to her time

who should assign us where to work or which work to do, our managers or the CEO because even if they are present she (CEO) will jump them and instruct us different tasks even if the mangers have assigned us different jobs, finding ourselves confused as to whom we should listen to because the CEO will tell us that she is used to firing people who take instructions from others if she is present.

Who should give us instructions concerning our work, the CEO or our managers?

■ The Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) issue has not been resolved as amounts are not the same starting from 2014-2016 but working for the same company and earning the same amounts

■ We have been taxed E18 as graded tax but when we consult Swaziland Revenue Authority this amount is not reflected.

At some point one of our colleagues went to do his public driving licences and was taxed and another went for his scholarship papers and was also taxed, who has kept these moneys?

■ Why did SIPA for this year, 2016 SITF bring a cleaning company and a painting contractor yet we have been doing this job for the past years or is it that SIPA has a lot of money? Yet the CEO told us we were expensive when she told us what was the reason of bringing a contractor, she then told us 31 October was our last day and the contractor would take over.

■ Does SIPA not have any benefit even medical aid, or insurance?

■ Which constitution does SIPA uses e.g. how long does it take for an employ ee to be confirmed?

■ Who is responsible for hiring and firing an employee at SIPA?

■ Why was our manager suspended, we want her back with immediate effect, the situation here in this organisation is becoming worse, when you stand against corruption or stand for the truth you will be a victim of being shown the exit door or suspension by the CEO.

E50 000 to apply for Mobile licence

THE regulatory body for the communications sector, the Swaziland Communications Commission (SCCOM) has finally revealed the bidding price of E50 000 to apply for an individual electronic communications network that will provide public communications services in the country.

This move will see other players being granted licences to compete with Swazi Mobile Network (MTN), which is something, according to the public, that will bring about healthy competition for the latter.

Through an advertisement in the media, it is stated that in accordance with the Electronic Communications Act, Section 11, the commission has invited applications for the provision of public telecommunications services in the country.

At a non-refundable fee of E50 000 the public or companies can apply for an individual electronic communications network licence and an individual electronic communications service licence. According to the general

notice, the commission will issue both licences to a single party to enable the provision of technology and service neutral network and voice, data and value added services.

"The successful bidder will furthermore be awarded a Frequency Spectrum Licence and will have access to spectrum 900 MHz, 2100 MHz and 2300 MHz bands in accordance with the National Frequency Plan and the Electronic Communications Regulations, 2016," part of the statement reads. Through this invitation to apply (ITA) process and the issuing of new licences to fixed and mobile operators in the country, the commission stated it was trying to change the market structure by promoting competition and improving the quality of services offered to people.

The commission further added this move would increase affordability and enable customer choice, which is something that would lead to the attainment of the goals and objectives of the Electronic Communications Act of 2013 and the National Information and Communications and Infrastructure (NICI) Policy Implementation Plan 2012-2016. The invitation to apply opened from the day before yesterday and will be closing on September 30, 2016.

This will bring the end of an era whereby MTN enjoyed the benefits of being a solo network provider in the country. Already there are service providers such as Vodacom which are lobbying via social media for support from the public to be recognised as potential service providers for the country.

Over 4 000 circumcised in 3 months

BETWEEN the month of April and June, over 4 000 Voluntary Medical Male Circumcisions (VMMC) were carried out.

This is contained in the ministry of health's first quarter budget performance report tabled in parliament by Minister Sibongile Simelane. In total there were 4 440 males circumcised.

The statistics were collected from all centres that conduct voluntary medical male circumcisions in the country.

In April there were 2 462 procedures conducted, in May there were 779 while in June there were 1 199 procedures conducted.

The report states that the Swaziland National HIV and AIDS programme (SNAP) says VMMC is one of the prioritized intervention that the country adopted as an additional way of strengthening HIV prevention. "Based on the undisputed evidence that male circumcision offers above 60% partial protection against HIV transmission in heterosexual relations, VMMC is intervention targeting males directly and also extending to sexual partners of circumcised male once they commence sexual activity. It is offered with a package that includes HIV testing services, age appropriation, condom promotion and distribution. It also offers screening and treatment of sexually transmitted infection and risk reduction counseling," it states.

...122 tested HIV positive

THE ministry of health's report further indicates that of the 2 462 who underwent the circumcision in April, 2 347 tested HIV negative.

At least 73 tested HIV positive and 42 patients' results were unknown.

In May, from the 779 patients,

748 tested HIV negative, while 22 tested HIV positive and nine patients' results were unknown.

Circumcised

In June, of the 1 199 who were circumcised, 1 162 tested negative, while 27 tested HIV positive and ten patient's results were unknown.

LAWYERS TO BOYCOTT SUPREME COURT

The country's legal practitioners have decided to boycott the Supreme Court until permanent judges are appointed.

The Supreme Court's second session is expected to commence on November 16, 2016 as announced by the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala through Lungile Msimango, the Registrar of the Supreme Court.

At a press conference held at the Mountain Inn yesterday, the Law Society of Swaziland (LSS) announced that its close to 500 members resolved to suspend their appearance before the Supreme Court until such time that the Supreme Court has a full complement of the bench that is permanent.

The lawyers said the issue of having acting judges was of great concern. They said it was unconstitutional and making appearance before such a court would suggest that they were legitimising it.

It would be the second time lawyers engage in a court boycott in about five years. The last time, they boycotted all of the country's courts in protest against a number issues touching on actions by the erstwhile Chief Justice Michael Ramodibedi.

They were complaining of a number of practice directives issued by Ramodibedi and for charging High Court Judge Thomas Masuku and hauling him before what they termed a kangaroo court.

Senior Mbabane lawyer Sidumo Mdladla, in his capacity as LSS Vice President, said lawyers took the decision to stop appearing before the Supreme Court in July 2016 in a meeting.

He was speaking on behalf of President Ben J Simelane. He said the last time there was a full complement of judges in the Supreme Court was during Ramodibedi's tenure, but most of the judges, who were foreign, did not return after the former JSC chairman was removed after his con-

..'We are not confrontational'

THE lawyers have succinctly stated that the suspension of their appearance before the Supreme Court was not confrontational.

Vice President of the Law Society of Swaziland Sidumo Mdladla said the members of the organisation merely wanted to convey a message across that they would not be part of a process they knew was illegal. He said the constitution was clear that by this time, there should be a full complement

viction on charges of misconduct.

"After that, the current chief justice would appoint judges on an ad hoc basis. Initially, the Law Society of Swaziland understood the circumstances which led to that scenario," Mdladla a former High Court acting judge said.

Appointed

He said High Court judges would be appointed to act as Supreme Court judges and this was later changed and legal practitioners were appointed on acting basis.

He said the latest arrangement was itself a compromise but the lawyers had made it clear that there should be permanent judges in the Supreme Court.

"We have engaged with the office of the chief justice and he has explained to us the problems with which his office and the judiciary is facing with regard to the appointment of the judges of the Supreme Court on permanent basis. In as much as we appreciate the challenges, we cannot condone them any longer. The view of the law society of Swaziland is that the Supreme Court is the highest court in the land and the last point of call in as far as the fountain of justice

of judges in the superior court. "In our view, this is a process that should not have taken this long and if we continue to be part of it, it will continue unabated, much to the detriment of this country and the private businesses," he said. He said the lawyers would wait patiently until the process to appoint the judges was finalised.

He said they hoped that those that were part of the process would realise the importance of having to attend to the process urgently.

is concerned," Mdladla said.

"As such, it should be beyond reproach and transparent and more than anything else, as the custodian of the constitution, its functions should hold strictly to the constitution."

Unconstitutional

He said the appointment of acting judges was not only unconstitutional, but eroded the well established jurisprudence that has been established over the years.

He said it eroded the integrity of the Supreme Court.

"As a result, the law society of Swaziland has come to the conclusion that no member should appear until the permanent complement of judges is made," Mdladla said.

The Registrar of the Supreme Court, when asked on the issue, asked to be furnished with a questionnaire which she was going to hand over to the JSC.

She was served at around 2pm, confirmed receipt and said she had given it to the chief justice. However, there had been no response by 6pm.

The chief justice's cell phone rang unanswered yesterday and he had not responded to a text message at the time of going to print.

It might take time - Lawyers

THE appointment of permanent judges of the Supreme Court is not expected to have been finalised by the time the second session of the court resumes.

This is a view held by lawyers

in consideration of the process and procedure followed in the appointment of judges. Vice-President of the law society of Swaziland Sidumo Mdladla said by the time the session commences on November 16, 2016, the process would not have been concluded.

Process

He said the process, in the lawyers' view, would not take anything less than 12 weeks, considering the seriousness of the issue and the international conventions Swaziland signed, governing the appointment of judges.

'Treat all courts equally'

THE Integrity of the Supreme Court and the Industrial Court of Appeal should be given the same treatment accorded to the High Court and Industrial Court, lawyers say.

The lawyers said the High Court and the Industrial Court had permanent judges, therefore, there was no reason why the Supreme Court should not have a full complement of the bench, given its status.

'Acting Supreme Court judges not paid'

SOME of the Judges who acted in the Supreme Court have still not been paid.

The Law Society of Swaziland has voiced their concern on the rumours to that effect doing rounds. It was stated that these may or not include some of the judges of the high Court or the lawyers who were appointed to be acting judges of the Supreme Court.

"This is untenable and speaks volumes about our approach to the independence of the judiciary. We'd urge that there should be a serious consideration to

address this anomaly as it is a cause for concern and an embarrassment," Vice-President Sidumo Mdladla said.

CJ CITES LACK OF RESOURCES

THE Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala is reported to have said resources barred him from appointing Supreme Court judges.

The Law Society of Swaziland

stated that when he voiced out the challenges he said the resources were limited and also hampered by the fact that the judiciary relied on the executive for the creation of posts.

Commissioner of labour waiting for KFC freezer report

THE Commissioner of Labour under the ministry of labour and social security Sipho Tsabedze is still awaiting a report from Kentucky Fried Chicken (KFC) on the freezer incident.

Tsabedze said his department would take appropriate action after getting and appreciating the report. Two employees were locked in a freezer by two managers in one of the Manzini branches of the eatery. The managers have since been moved to Mbabane.

One of the freezer victims Nondumiso Mavuso has been sent home and her last day at work is next Monday.

Asked on the case of Mavuso, the commissioner advised her to report her case with the Conciliation, Mediation and **Arbitration Commission** (CMAC). "It is tricky to fere in a company's internal disciplinary process, hence we have been waiting for a report from the eatery as they had told us they will be doing investigations in this matter and we are following it closely," Tsabedze said. He added that after the report from the eatery has been submitted to their office, they will then check if all the right procedures were rightly followed in dealing with it.

"CMAC will deal with this matter the right way they know how as they are the right people to handle it," he added.



We are against short term contracts - Commissioner

THE Commissioner of Labour Sipho Tsabedze said the ministry is against short term contracts for established long term businesses.

"We do not understand how they can hire people under short term contracts yet they are a continuous business. This is why we will be working on this issue of contracts to ensure that the right procedures are followed without taking desperate people for a ride," he said. Tsabedze added that short term contracts are only for short term businesses.





SOLDIERS TO BE PAID WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION

MEMBERS of Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF) might be paid Workmen's Compensation.

This will only happen if the Workmen's Compensation (Amendment) Bill of 2015 is enacted to be legislation. This legislation was tabled yesterday in the Senate by Minister for Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula.

The amended Bill aims to include the soldiers and domestic workers to be paid what is known as a Workmen's Compensation. The Workmen's Compensation is the money that is paid to workers who get injured or sick while at work. The laws governing the country require employers to pay a certain amount of money towards an insurance that pays for such incidents once they happen. The Bill will amend the Workmen's Compensation Act of 1983.

Section 2 of the act excluded soldiers and domestic workers from being paid such benefits, even if they got injured at workplaces. The act did not classify them as workers

Magagula, when tabling the Bill before the senators, stated that the act proved to be discriminatory towards these groups of people. She said such constituted a violation of Convention III on Discrimination (Employment and Occupation) and Section 20 of the constitution of the country. This section requires that all people should be treated equally before the law.

Employees

"With regard to domestic employees, it will be recalled that not so long ago, member states of the International Labour Organisation (ILO) adopted Convention No. 189 Concerning Decent Work for Domestic Employees," Magagula said. She said the adoption of the convention was in line with and gave effect to the four strategic principles concerning fundamental rights at work as contained in the 1998 declaration, namely "the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation."

The bill, Magagula said, sought to align definition of certain words in the interpretation section with those given by other labour statutes in the country. The words included "courts" and "employer." "The word "court" will now be broad as

it used to refer only to the Industrial Court. It will also include the Magistrate's Courts for those violations of the Workmen's Compensation Act which constitutes criminal offences," she said. She also explained the meaning of the word "employer" to the senators. "The current definition of this word is limited as it does not appreciate the continuing nature of the employment relationship and obligations related to the employer is in liquidation or in the case of death of an employer, who is a sole proprietor," the minister said.

Magagula said the definition must therefore include a liquidator, a trustee of a sole proprietor's insolvent estate and an executor of his estate in case of his death.

The Bill sought to bring the Workmen's Compensation Act No.7 of 1983 into conformity with international labour standards.

They include Convention No. 189
Concerning Decent Work for Domestic
Employees, Convention No.111
Concerning Discrimination (Employment and Occupation), and ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at
Work and its follow-up of 1988.

Where is the state jet? - MPs

LUDZELUDZE MP Bambumuti Sithole asked the minister for foreign affairs and trade to explain the position of the country's jet.

Sithole said the last time they heard about it from the ministry it was being refurbished. Since then, the legislator said there has been no report whatsoever yet as parliamentarians they needed to be updated on the matter so they could assist where possible.

Motshane MP Phesheya
Hlatshwayo told the acting
Minister, Princess Tsandzile, that it
was parliament that took the
decision to purchase the state jet
and therefore it was well within

their rights to know the developments with regard to the purchase. He said when they took the decision, the country then was losing a lot of money through hiring aircrafts and did not want that to persist.

Questioned

MP Christopher Gamedze questioned why the report reflected that when E96 million for the state aircraft was transferred, there were savings of E5 million. He said their expectation was the whole amount should have been paid.

The minister would provide the answers next Monday. She said they had continued to strive to utilize the allocated public funds for the first quarter in line with their portfolio responsibility as well as government rules, regulations, standards and statutes.

Has ministry turned loan sharks?

MEMBER of Parliament Christopher Gamedze has questioned the release of a sum of E11 million by the ministry of foreign affairs and international cooperation to the ministry of economic planning and development.

The Mafutseni legislator wondered if the ministry was now in the business of lending money because, although the purpose of the money was stated it was to pay for SADC subscriptions for the country, he could not understand why it was not paid from the economic planning and development vote.

The legislator also questioned the ministry for its failure to submit to parliament the international instruments which the country signed for. These are international treaties, protocols and conventions. Gamedze wanted to know why the ministry had to be pushed by His Majesty the King to do its job of tabling the instruments. This was during the debate of the first quarter performance report of the ministry of foreign affairs and international cooperation for the financial year 2016/2017. The ministry's substantive Leader Minister Chief Mgwagwa Gamedze was repre-

sented by Minister Princess
Tsandzile, the substantive minister for home affairs. Princess
Tsandzile said the ministry was
highly thankful to both houses of
parliament for their continued
insight and support in the debate
relating to the ministry's responsibilities and budget in previous
performance reports.

"On that note, we appreciate government's efforts in ensuring the country continues to overcome the economic challenges that led to the worst depression since independence," she said in her preamble. With regard to the concerns of the MPs, she requested that she be allowed to bring written answers on Monday.

Senators sceptical of domestic workers' empowerment

SENATORS are finding it hard to include domestic workers in the Workmen's Compensation as they fear it might prove costly for them.

The lawmakers said this yesterday during the debate of the Workmen's Compensation (Amendment) Bill of 2015. The senators felt some domestic workers could take advantage of the situation and injure themselves with the hope of claiming the Workmen's Compensation. Prince Fipha said he wanted to know what could be done to avoid such. Senator Chief Ngome Ndlangamandla stated there were no workers in rural areas. "We are relatives there. We help one another. You cannot then say such a person, whom I regard as my own child, should be paid by me.

That person eats my food and uses my other resources like my children," Ndlangamandla said.

He said there would be a lot of fights now between domestic workers and their employers because they would be demanding a lot from them.

Senator Meninjeni Mahlalela doubted if helping one another would still be there with such legislation in place. He said people would now want to be employed in order to be given money.

Princess Phumelele expressed concern on how such could be done. She said the new arrangement would require contributions like provident fund to be made by the employees and the employers. She said if such arrangements were to be put in place, how much a domestic worker would earn, if her wage was E800 per month. Senator David Dlamini said there were people who were occupying low paying jobs. He said these individuals would hire others to look after cattle for them. He wanted to know how they would handle such situations.

Magagula, in response, said senators should not worry about a situation where they would be arranging for help with their relatives.

She said that was not employment. She said employment was a situation where a person would be given resources to perform a task on regular basis and be given money such as a salary, or wages. "If senators are in such arrangements, this means they are now employers and they should follow all the requirements that should be met by the employers," Magagula said.

Guest finds couple having sex in his hotel room

A guest had the shock of his life when he found strangers having sexual intercourse in his room at the Royal Swazi Sun Hotel.

This newspaper has learnt that the man had booked a room with his spouse at the hotel and they left their belongings to go out for some business.

A senior employee of the hotel then took advantage that the guests had gone out and used a master key to sneak her friends who are lovers into the room in the hotel to have intimate time together. A master key enables selected members of staff to have access to the rooms anytime, however, each master is personalised to enable identification of the owner of the key used to open a room. Identities of the parties have been intentionally concealed because investigations are still ongoing.

The two lover birds are said to have enjoyed time together in the room and things got intimate. They engaged in

sexual intercourse.

However, the couple returned from their business outside the hotel and proceeded straight to their room and used their guest key. Unbeknown, they opened their room only to be met by screams from their bedroom.

The two lovebirds were caught red handed having sexual intercourse, an inside source said. The incident reportedly happened on August 20.

"They might have gone out of the hotel or were gambling within the premises," the source said.

It is reported that the guest couple feared their belongings might have been stolen. The hotel management launched an investigation together with the police and it was discovered that a master key belonging to one of the employees had been used. However, it was discovered the employee concerned had not been working at the RSS on the day, but had been stationed at the Lugogo Sun and had left her key in her office she shared with a female employee. "When surveillance cameras were viewed, it was

discovered the key was actually used by the female officer's office mate. The owner of the master key is an assistant to her office mate," the source said. The source said the two employees were immediately suspended while investigations were ongoing and to enable the national activities that were ongoing to conclude. The source said the employees feared that the employee was being sabotaged by her colleague with whom they share an office.

The hotel management did not want to comment on the matter. Sun International's Area Manager Lance Rossouw only said, "I have no comment to your questionnaire," via email.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati, confirmed that an inquiry file was opened at the Lobamba Police Station on the matter. "Those allegations are existent, but we are still conducting our investigations to determine the nature of the crime and what charges could be preferred. No arrests have been made yet," Vilakati said.

Embassies run on shoe-string budget

KUBUTA MP Njabulo Mabuza expressed disappointment that the country's embassies were being run on a shoe-string budget, wondering why such negative state of affairs was allowed.

Mabuza said in every country where Swaziland was represented, the ambassadors and high commissioners there were complaining about inadequate budgets. He said that was very embarrassing and appealed to the minister to address this concern.

He said some of these foreign offices were so crucial to the development of the country, making an example with the Republic of China on Taiwan.

He said it was to the detriment of the country that the embassy was run without any meaningful budget yet Swaziland benefited so much from Taiwan in terms of development.

Mabuza said the more the country put money there, the more it stood to

benefit. MP Bambumuti Sithole, however, wanted to know how many direct foreign investments had been received by the country through its foreign representatives. He said besides those that were requested by the king, they should be others that invest in the country through their efforts and if they had any challenges doing that what were those challenges. The ministry received a total recurrent budget of more than E696 million and more than E3.5 million capital expenditure. The minister said although they valued the allocation. it continued to be inadequate.

She said during the budget input the ministry was given a ceiling of E238 million for recurrent expenditure. She said additional requests were made for priority activities which were unavoidable, ultimately increasing the total of the recurrent budget requested to more than E655 million.

said to have changed tune and ordered the pupils to work for the said deal. A relative to the teenagers has alleged that the boys were used to transport dagga to buyers.

This was said to be a way of raising funds for extra costs in their music recording.

Upon their arrest, the man who is said to have been using the teenagers is said to have managed to escape and evaded arrest.

Meanwhile, some of the boys' parents have said the arrest of their children had somehow brought a sigh of relief because at least they are alive.

The parents have been worried as they did not know where their children went as they left without reporting. This left the parents running from pillar to post as they searched for them.

"At some point we had to seek spiritual assistance to trace the whereabouts of the children and finally I am happy that at least now I know where to find them," said one of the boys' guardians who wanted to be identified as Maziya.

Crown drops charges against car dealer

A man who operates as a car dealer could not hide his joy when the court announced that his charges of theft by false pretences had been withdrawn, hence he was a free man.

Mgcibelo Maziya (37) was arrested in 2014 after he was accused of defrauding his clients.

According to the charge sheet, he was alleged to have unlawfully and intentionally defrauded one Mbuso Zwane a sum of E11 000 while using false pretences.

He was said to have promised the complainant that he would assist him register his motor vehicle by paying all the costs to the Swaziland Revenue

Authority (SRA) while knowing that he did not intend to.

He was further charged with a similar charge in that he unlawfully and intentionally defrauded Kwanele Simelane a sum of E1 780.

Maziya was said to have promised the complainant that he would buy motor vehicle parts to repair his vehicle, and thereby collected the said amount.

Maziya was later admitted to E2 000 bail while commencement of the trial remained pending.

Last week, he was re-arrested and charged with contempt of court after he was accused of failing to avail himself for trial after having been duly warned to do so on August 19, 2016.

He pleaded guilty to the charge and was accordingly found guilty by the

court.

He was sentenced to 60 days in a correctional facility with an option to pay E120 fine. The court further ordered that the amount of E2 000 which was paid as bail be forfeited to the state while the accused person be remanded in custody until the completion of his trial.

During his appearance before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso yesterday, the crown filed an application to have the charges of theft by false pretences withdrawn.

The prosecutor, however, did not state the reasons of withdrawing the matter. The accused who was represented by lawyer Mzobanzi Dlamini did not object to the application.

The charges were eventually withdrawn. The court, however, stated that the bail amount remained forfeited to the state.

5 YEARS IN JAIL FOR FORCEFULLY KISSING FRIEND'S GIRLFRIEND

AFTER having had his case transferred from the Mbabane National Court to the Magistrate's Court, the young man charged with forcefully kissing and fondling private parts of a woman has been sentenced to pay a fine of E5 000 or spend five years in jail.

The matter was initially attended by the Swazi National Court on Monday but it had to be stopped after it developed into a bigger case than it appeared.

Ntokozo Tsabedze is regretting his lustful actions after receiving this heavy sentence and he told Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi he was remorseful.

The 20-year-old was charged with indecent assault together with the victim's boyfriend Siboniso Ngwenya (30), both from Maphalaleni.

They were charged with indecent assault in that upon September 8 while at Maphalaleni, at Siboniso's house, the accused persons, acting jointly in the furtherance of a common purpose did wrongfully, unlawfully and intentionally commit an act of an indecent character upon Ngwenya's girlfriend.

It is alleged that Ngwenya suggested that Tsabedze should have sexual intercourse with the complainant. While inside the house with the complainant, Tsabedze allegedly pushed her towards the bed, laid on top of her, pulled her dress and kissed her without her consent and did commit the said offence.

Separated

While appearing in court, the two were separated after Tsabedze confirmed he was not sent by the complainant's boyfriend to commit the said offence.

"I never sent him to do what he did. He told me he was hungry and I told him go inside my house and take food," Ngwenya defended himself.
After this, the court separated the two and Ngwenya was taken out of the accused's box.

As Tsabedze had pleaded guilty he was convicted and found guilty as per his own plea. He said what he did was a mistake while adding he never pulled the complainant's dress.

"I am sorry for my actions. I would also like to pass my sincere apologies to the complainant for my bizarre actions," he said.

However, Ngwenya was not entirely let off the hook as he was separately charged for indecent assault as well in that he allowed Tsabedze to have sexual intercourse with his girlfriend without her consent.

He appeared before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati on the same day after appearing before Nhlabatsi and his case was postponed to next Wednesday.

"You will come back on September 21 for trial, bail is opposed by the crown, and you will be remanded back into custody," Vilakati said.

The dejected man was taken to custody together with his partner in crime by the investigating officers. The complainant was ordered to come back on Wednesday to lead evidence before court.

THE European Union (EU) has tabled another continental opportunity in which the country also stands a good chance to benefit from.

This is through the launch of the European External Investment Plan (EIP) 2016, an ambitious programme aimed at supporting investment in EU partner countries in Africa and the European neighbourhood.

According to a statement released by the EU from the European Commission, the EIP worth €315 billion (over E5 000 billion) was launched yesterday by the European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker, during his 2016 State of the Union address before the European Parliament in Strasbourg.

The president said €116 billion (close to E2 000 billion) has already been raised in the first year of the EIP operation.

EU Ambassador, Nicola Bellomo said alongside the recently ratified Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA), this would provide a good platform for the country and the continent's development.

However, he said it would take some time for the benefits to materialise due to the technicalities involved.

"But at the right time, we will stand ready to unpack the plan and make sure we disseminate the relevant information to explore the opportunities that exists in the plan, especially for the private sector in Swaziland."

During the launch, President Juncker said in the plan the commission set out how it plans to further boost investment to support jobs and sustainable growth, both in Europe and globally.

"The Commission proposes to extend its successful European Fund for Strategic Investments, at the heart of its Investment Plan for Europe, to increase its fire-power and reinforce its strengths; and to set up a new European External Investment Plan (EIP) to encourage investment in Africa and the EU Neighbourhood to strengthen our partnerships and contribute to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals," reads the statement in part.

The statement states that the EIP consists of three complementary pillars; firstly, to mobilise investment by combining existing investment facilities with a new guarantee within the new European Fund for Sustainable Development (EFSD). The EFSD will be composed of two regional investment platforms for Africa and the neighborhood.

Secondly, it seeks to step up technical assistance for broader policy environment to support public authorities and companies in partner countries. The aim is to help them to better prepare and promote projects and attract more investment.

Thirdly, it seeks to improve the general business environment by fostering good governance, fighting corruption and removing barriers to investment and market distortions.

The commission said the EIP offers an integrated framework enabling full cooperation among the EU, member states, partner countries, international financial institutions, donors and the private sector.

"It will improve the way in which scarce public funds are used and the way public authorities and private investors work together on investment projects. Through the EIP the EU will take a further step to contribute to the global architecture for

development and management of migration, the two themes that will be at the centre of the discussion during the upcoming United Nations General Assembly."

Assembly." Vice-President Jyrki Katainen, responsible for jobs, growth, investment and competitiveness, said they were providing additional financing for innovative projects and SMEs under the European Fund for Strategic Investments, "we are helping businesses prepare funding applications through the Advisory Hub; we are letting investors worldwide know what investment opportunities exist in Europe through the Project Portal; and we are bringing down barriers to investment through the Capital Markets Union and other EU initiatives. I am very satisfied with the Investment Plan's results so far and I look forward to discussing our new proposal with Members of the European

Parliament and Member States

in the weeks to come."

KM III RECORDS 13 800 USERS IN THREE MONTHS

KM III International Airport has recorded about 13 855 cross-border travellers in a space of three months.

This is contained in the Ministry of Home Affairs first quarter performance report for 2016/2017.

KM III has recorded a total number of 6717 arrivals between the month of April and June and recorded a total number of 7 138 departures. Meanwhile, during the same period Matsapha Airport recorded 209 arrivals and 190 departures.

Recorded On the other hand, the country recorded a total number of 718 583 visitors between April and June 2016 on land border posts. The report revealed that most travellers

travelled through the Ngwenya/Oshoek border followed by Lavumisa.

In the three months, Ngwenya

recorded a total of 261 800 arrivals, while Lavumisa recorded 81 483. The border gate with the least visitors was Lundzi which recorder 1 627 visitors.

In total, there were 1 437 708 cross border travellers between April and June. More than a third which is 36.2% of the cross-border travellers crossed through the

Ngwenya/Oshoek border followed by Lavumisa with 11.3%. On the bottom of the ranking with less than 1% are Lundzi, Bulembu and Gege.

15 000 travel documents issued

DURING the first quarter of 2016/2017, 15 527 travel documents were issued during between April and June.

41.8% of the travel documents were issued in Mbabane and 20.6% were issued in Manzini. In the month of April, Mbabane issued 2 286 travel documents. in May they issued 2 247 and in June they issued 1 965 travel documents.

While in Manzini in the month of April, 1 126 were issued, 1 095 in May and 970 in June.

The least issued travel docu-

ments were in Luve and Lomahasha. In the three months, 46 travel documents were issued in Luve while 136 were issued in Lomahasha.

The report further reveals that this numbers cover only issued travel documents not printed travel documents. "There are a lot that have been printed and just awaiting collection by applicants and or bearers from the various service centres strategically located around the country," the report states.

24 DIVORCES REGISTERED

A total of 24 divorces were registered between the month of April and June.

All the divorces were registered at the Mbabane headquarters. In April 10, divorces were registered, six in May and eight in June. Meanwhile, between April and June there were 6 639 marriages in all the country's four regions. Of the total, 2 279 were civil marriages and 4 360 were Swazi Law and Custom marriage. "The marriages registrations are current, late certificate and certified copies," states the report.

Correctional Services praised by MPs

HIS Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) has been praised by Members of Parliament for its performance.

The MPs took turns in praising HMCS Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase for displaying good leadership qualities that have transformed the organisation.

You can see that the barrier is being closed as time goes on and it is unlike previously when the inmates were discriminated by members of the communities," Ndwandwe said.

Ndwandwe then urged the department to ensure that jails were built in other areas to absorb the influx of people who were kept in jails because their numbers were seen to be increasing.

Ludzeludze MP Bambumuti Sithole also praised the department. He said they worked with limited resources and were able to produce good results, unlike other departments who always

He, however, urged the department to be vigilant in eradicating the possibility of the spread of HIV and AIDS among the inmates because there were certain activities that happened in there that had a potential of spreading the virus. He was not comfortable in mentioning those activities.

Lobamba MP Michael Masilela said people were transformed by the correctional services. Some of them became preachers who even preached on national radio stations. Some were

even doing jobs like welding and were able to generate money.

Zombodze Emuva MP Titus Thwala said the department was doing a wonderful job. However, he challenged the department to build correctional schools in all the regions of the country. "Some parents want their children to be schooled there because they see that children from that school become

SNPF conversion to pension going at snail's pace - MPs

THE ministry of labour and social security is still working on how to convert the Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) to a pension fund.

This is a fund where people working in the private sector contribute their money while they are still employed. The idea is for them to get the money once they retire from their workplaces. The idea to convert the provident fund to a pension fund was to enable the SNPF members to get their pension money on monthly basis.

This is because the members have a tendency of easily depleting the money once they are given in its entirety, like it is the case now.

Manzini North Member of Parliament Jan Sithole wanted Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula to update the labour portfolio committee on the process. Sithole said the issue had been quiet now for some time and they would like to know what was happening concerning that process. Magagula said the bill supporting the conversion of SNPF had already been submitted to Cabinet. She said this was to be followed by the tabling of the bill to Parliament by the ministry of labour and social security. However, this was not to be as Cabinet called for some issues to be resolved before the conversion could take place.

"The first issue was that the first people to benefit from the pension fund would be those who had contributed for a period of 15 years under the pension fund," Magagula said. The cabinet is said to have

found it hard to accept that fact. They asked the ministry and SNPF to shorten the number of years for which members could benefit once the provident fund was converted into a pension fund.

Magagula further highlighted that they also had to improve on the social security aspect of the ministry because they had been focussing more on the labour aspect. She said the social security had three pillars. One of them was the pension.

The ministry of labour was entrusted with coming up with a national pension fund. The pension fund would cater for every person that was working in order for them to be able to earn some income even once they had retired.

Pillar

The second pillar is the workman's compensation. Cabinet wanted the ministry to come up with a workman's compensation fund.

The compensation would be accessible to all those who were working and deserved to get a workman's compensation.

This would be funded by the employers who were required to pay the compensation. Government would also help because it paid its own portion. The third pillar is the health insurance fund. The health insurance fund would be there to cater for people who would fall sick while at work. Magagula even said the cabinet advised the ministry that the money it contributed in Phalala Fund could be monitored by the ministry under the health insurance fund so that the money could be accessible to everyone because the one in Phalala was catering for only a certain type of people. She said SNPF could only be converted after all these things had been done.

MPs question lawyers' services

LAWYERS' services have come under scrutiny from the Members of Parliament (MPs) as they want to know how their fees are charged.

The legislators wanted Minister for Justice and Constitutional Affairs Edgar Hillary to state the criteria used by lawyers to charge for their fees. This was at Senate during the first quarter performance report of the justice ministry. The lawmakers felt the learned friends were just charging for their services willy-nilly. Kubutha MP Njabulo Mabuza said the fees which were charged by the lawyers for their services were very different. "This shows that there is no regulation that looks at the way in which we are charged by the lawyers," Mabuza

He wanted to know what was done to lawyers who were found to have depleted estates belonging to certain people, especially widows.

Mabuza's sentiments were shared by Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini. He said there were many such cases in the country where lawyers would deplete people's money and get

impartiality of the Law Society of Swaziland, "The chairperson, secretary and some members in the Law Society are lawyers. How can your case be treated with impartiality by the Law Society when a lawyer has wronged you?" Dlamini asked.

He went on to state that in Dvokodvweni, they had a case whereby some residents in his constituency had become victims of such circumstances. He said the lawyer depleted the people's money, which amounted to millions of Emalangeni.

The case has not been tried in any of the courts or even the Law Society. This matter, according to the MP, has dragged for five to six years. Dlamini said there many other similar cases in the country. He stated that the Dvokodvweni

case was just one of many others. In response, Hillary said there was a Legal Practitioners' Act that regulated the services of the lawyers in the country. He said lawyers were not at liberty to do as they pleased and they were not

immune to being prosecuted. Hillary went on to remind the MPs that there was a certain lawyer who was once convicted for depleting money belonging to

'RAPED' WOMAN ARRESTED FOR ABORTION WITH FRIEND

A woman who claimed she was raped has been arrested together with her friend and charged with abortion.

She has been charged with aborting an unborn child using Cycotec pills.

The two, Charity Nxumalo and Ncobile Fakudze, were arrested by police after they were found to have used Cytotec pills to commit the crime.

They appeared at the Matsapha Circuit Court before Magistrate Lucia Lukhele on Tuesday.

They pleaded guilty to the charge and admitted they acted jointly to commit the abortion. When asked why they committed such an act, Nxumalo said she was forced to abort the child because she got pregnant after being raped by an unknown man.

The accused told the magistrate the shame of being a survivor of rape was just too much for her, which is why she came to the decision of aborting the child.

She added she was even afraid to even report the matter to the police.

Nxumalo said she was worried that she was not well off as she was earning a living by being a cleaner at Gundvwini Royal Kraal, therefore will not be able to support the child. The accused then approached her friend Fakudze and told her about her ordeal. Fakudze offered the Cycotex pills to her which she used to successfully carry out the abortion. Fakudze, who was second accused in the matter, confirmed that she gave her friend Cytotec pills after learning about her rape ordeal. Fakudze said her friend came to her asking for the medication so she could treat ulcers.

Issue

When asked if she was a doctor or nurse to issue medication to people, Fakudze admitted she was neither of the two but was just a labourer working for Jet Store in Manzini.

Fakudze started by telling the court her friend told her she wanted the pills to treat ulcers.

Misoprostol, which is another name for Cycotec, is said to be helpful in decreasing risks of serious ulcer complications such as bleeding.

Fakudze, however, when probed further revealed she knew very well that Cycotec is not for ulcers but used strictly for abortion.

She confessed having been aware that her friend was intending to use the pills to commit an abortion and further told the court she brought the pills from South Africa.

The magistrate had a hard time in getting a straight answer from Fakudze as to why she helped her friend abort an unborn child.

Fakudze just admitted it was wrong for her to do that.

Magistrate Lukhele was not pleased with the situation and she did not take kindly to Nxumalo's excuse that she committed the abortion because she was afraid of reporting the rape ordeal to the police. What irritated the magistrate even more was that while mitigating in court Nxumalo was smiling, clearly not showing remorse for her action.

The magistrate told the accused that if she (Nxumalo) could tell the court about her rape ordeal, she could have done the same with the police.

Lukhele said she should have reported the matter to police as nowadays there were officers who deal specifically with such matters. Even female police officers she could have confided to them.

The magistrate condemned the actions of the two accused and told Fakudze that as someone who was 33 years old she should know better not to help people commit such crimes.

Nxumalo and Fakudze were each sentenced to two years imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000. The duo asked that since they were out on bail of E1 500, this should be converted to form part of the fine.

Lukhele granted their pleas and they added a E500 fine per person to gain their freedom.

...What will your child learn from you?, Magistrate asks

MAGISTRATE Mucia Lukhele strongly condemned the act of the two accused persons for not reporting such a matter to the police.

Upon enquiring if the two had children to which they responded to the affirmative, the magistrate asked Nxumalo what kind of advice she gives to her child if she acts like this. Lukhele lectured the two telling them that if as parents they were afraid to report such forms of abuse, how then will they be able to advise their children. The teary Nxumalo pointed out to the court that she is a single parent as her husband deserted her after they broke up. The incident comes at a

time when the police are going in full force sensitising the public about the Children's Protection and Welfare Act. Speaking in one of the programmes on Swaziland Broadcasting and Information Services over the weekend, Welile Ngcamphalala from the Royal Swaziland Police Domestic Violence and Child Protection Unit said the right to life was one of the basic rights for every human being.

The officer pointed out that as police, they were working in line with the Bible in enforcing these rights and anyone who contravenes the Children's Protection Act would face the wrath of the law.

Another woman (20) arrested for deserting 10-month-old baby

ANOTHER woman Gcinile Mntjali (20) of Boyane was arrested for deserting her two children aged 10 months and three years.

The accused made her appearance before Matsapha Circuit Court Magistrate Lucia Lukhele on Tuesday.

She was remanded back into police custody and advised that if she wants to gain her liberation, she must pay bail amounting to E1 500.

The accused made it clear she does not have the required amount and was sent back into police custody pending her next court appearance.

The prosecutor initially thought of accepting her plea of guilty without leading any evidence but the magistrate pointed out the seriousness of the offence.

Mntjali, when asked where the children were as she was behind bars, she stated they were with her mother back home.

Burnt E1.2m house: Family now uses garage as shelter

According to the state witness' evidence, the victim had run away from home after having an argument with her father.

Due to the cold weather that fateful day, the young girl went around asking for warm clothes from people she knew around Mashibhini, until she

came across one of the suspects, who offered to give her a jersey.

A police officer while leading evidence, alleged that on April 29, she received a report about a minor being raped by two men from Nkosingiphile Shabangu and that was when she proceeded to interview the said v

Argument

"During the interview with the victim your worship, she alleged that after the argument with her father she went to wind off under the gum trees at Mashibhini until late. She said she then went to her father's friend, Machawe, to borrow a jersey but could not find him and that is when she went around looking for someone who could borrow her a jersey," Dlamini said.

She said Sandile Dlamini, then allegedly went to his house, and he left her there and locked the door.

"She told me that he came back later and found her in bed, she said he slept

on the floor until midnight and he asked to join her as he complained of cold. After jumping into bed, he then asked to have sex with her, and she agreed," she said.

The police officer said the young girl had told her that Sicelo came in the

"She said Sicelo asked Sandile's whereabouts but he had left and he also asked to sleep with her and she agreed. This happened for about two days, the accused took turns in having sex with her as one would go and the other one come," she said.

The young girl ended up at the Lobamba police station and the police took her to the Mbabane government hospital for examination. It was confirmed that she was penetrated. The two suspects were arrested on May 5.

Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati postponed the matter to September 27.

"You are remanded out of custody, go and think properly and come back with made up minds. Do not cause havoc in the meantime," the magistrate cautioned the accused.

CHESHIRE HOMES FINANCE OFFICER ARRESTED FOR THEFT

CHESHIRE Homes Finance and Administration Officer Nonhlanhla Simelane has been arrested for allegedly embezzling the entity's funds amounting to E47 922 last year,

It is alleged Cheshire Homes Director Muzi Dlamini uncovered the abnormality in the finances last year in August when the accused was away on a trip.

Testifying before court on Tuesday, Dlamini said Simelane was sent on a workshop and a person was hired as a stand-in for her while she was away. The director said a patient came with her child to pay at the centre which provides rehabilitation to people with physical disabilities.

Dlamini said the father reported that the receipt was with Simelane.

Informed

When called about the whereabouts of the receipts, Simelane informed her colleagues to check under a calendar which was on her desk in her office. Dlamini said after a search they found the receipt but to his surprise the figure was cancelled using a tippex. This then raised his suspicions because he knew that Simelane had been trained in finances and she knew better that one was not supposed to use a tippex to cancel figures but rather must cancel so it would be clear what he or she had cancelled.

Dlamini said when taking a clos-

er look, he saw the figure on the receipt and the one recorded on the books did not coincide.

He told the court that upon a further search, he discov-

ered a lot of other cancelled out receipts and photocopied receipt books.

The director shed some light to the court about the organisation.

He said the money received by the entity was used to buy food for the patients and other equipment.

When the charge of theft was read to Simelane during her court appearance before Magistrate Lucia Lukhele, she pleaded not guilty to the offence.

The crown was represented by Fakazi

Mngomezulu who paraded the director as the witness in the matter. The director of Cheshire presented the receipts and other documents to court and proceedings adjourned as copies of the receipts and documents were to be made.



PLANTATION STRIKE ENDS AS WORKERS OFFERED 13% INCREASE

By Sizwe Dlamini Pigg's Peak

THE month-long strike by workers of the Plantation Forest Company ended on Tuesday and the 460 employees are back at work.

Swaziland Agriculture Plantation Workers Union (SAPWU)
Secretary General Manqoba
Dlamini, said the month-long strike ended as the Plantation Forest
Company agreed to a 13 percent wage increment for the employees and a further 12 percent to all casual workers across the board.

The striking workers had demanded 16 percent when the strike originally started on August 11, but the company had offered only 9.5 percent increment.

After much discussion between

the Plantation Forest Company and representatives of SAPWU, the 13

percent wage increment was discussed and accepted by both parties,

signalling an end to the protracted

The company further agreed to have an ambulance on standby to rush the workers to hospital if they so required. The entity further agreed to improve working conditions.

Dlamini said the workers were brave and fought very hard to earn the wage increment against all odds and adversity.

"It has been a very long and hard road for the striking workers who have gone a whole month without

They would wake up in their respective homes and head to the company's entrance to stage a sit-in. They wanted improved working conditions and we are happy to have reached amicable conclusions," he said.

On that note, Chairperson to the striking Plantation workers Sibusiso Masuku, said the workers had reached a compromise that was understandable.

"The strike officially ended in talks, we are grateful for the compromise and hope the company will eventually consider the 16 percent wage increment we had hoped for when the strike originally started," he said.

Church bodies decry lack of regulation

THE lack of a legislation monitoring the formation and operations of churches in Swaziland means the country will continue to have too many unregulated churches.

This is an observation by the Swaziland Conference of Churches (SCC), Council of Swaziland Churches (CSC) and the League of African Churches.

Council of Swaziland Churches (SCC) Spokesman Reverend Bonginkhosi Malaza said the influx of churches within the country was not a bad thing, but it meant starting a church was very easy and people could take advantage of this.

"The influx of churches means it is very easy to start a church in the country and this is not a bad thing to start with.

However, we have seen that because there is no legislation to regulate these churches, foreigners can come to Swaziland and open a church. This is detrimental as we do not know the foreigners' back- ground," he said.

Supposed

Malaza said the ministry of home affairs was supposed to be championing laws to govern the formation of churches as well as regulating their operations.

However, he said this was not happening and this allowed pastors who might have been criminals in their home countries to come and establish in the country and hide in their new formed churches.

"We have seen foreigners just walk into the country and form a church, it is too easy and many of these pastors have no traceable backgrounds. It is up to the ministry of home affairs to

regulate the establishments of churches," he said.

On that note, a senior on the governing body of SCC said the lack of a regulatory law meant many churches were free to act as businesses and not churches.

"Many churches are businesses that specialise in the sale of hope and dreams in exchange for money clothed as tithes and offerings. Many times we have heard of cases where pastors have told church members to offer more money in the exchange of dreams that will come true. This is wrong and there should be a law to govern churches against such practices," the pastor said.

The pastor said a piece of legislation would allow individuals to differentiate between a church and a cult.

Tired

"We are tired of these new establishments calling themselves churches, so many of them have unique beliefs like the use of oils, tissues, scarfs and coloured waters."

The pastor noted that within the League of African Churches, starting a church in Swaziland was very simple.

"To start a church in Swaziland, all an individual has to do is be affiliated to one of the three church mother bodies in the country; namely, the League of African Churches, SCC and CSC.

This affiliation at the ministry of home affairs in Mbabane and that is all," added the pastor. The pastor said churches were unregulated; an individual could rent any small room and start a church.

Employees at the ministry of home affairs confirmed that starting a church in Swaziland was too easy noting a lot of foreigners knew this and were taking advantage of it.

First water and sanitation joint sector review next week

THE ministry of natural resources and energy, department of water affairs, will next week host the first ever water and sanitation joint sector review.

Nompumelelo Ntjalintjali, Principal Water Development Analyst in the ministry, said the objective of the review exercise would be reviewing the progress made by the sector since 2013 when the current parliamentarians were sworn-into office.

"We will be stock-taking progress in the sector to targets, strategies, recommendations and identifying challenges, recapping on challenges.

We also will be proposing a way forward based on the outcome report which will establish a tracking framework for action points," she said.

There would also be information sharing and dissemination for dialogue, accountability, sharing of best practice, coordination and harmonisation and problem solving.

Also they would review the current planning, budgeting, reporting, and monitoring cycle in the WASH sector, and consider how Joint Sector Reviews (JSRs) and Sector –Wide Approaches to planning (SWAp) may be integrated, and actions needed to strengthen and institutionalise the cycle.

Approximately 150 stakeholders, including senior government and members of parliament, delegates from a range of government ministries and agencies, non-governmental and development partners, civil society, various water users, private sector, academia would be part of the review.

Ntjalintjali said the Joint Sector Reviews (JSRs) on the water and sanitation sectors were currently undertaken in 70+ countries, and were widely regarded as best practice, as the events help bring a wide range of stakeholders together on a periodic basis to appraise sector performance, engage in dialogue, and propose solutions to identified sector challenges. She said JSRs were recurrent events, often annual, and were key milestones in the sector planning, reporting and monitoring cycle.

The event comes at an opportune time for the water and sanitation sector. It would fall in the middle of the 2014-18 period of the current strategic plans of the line ministries working in the sector, allowing a perfect opportunity to review progress and projections, and also challenges and solutions to achieve the strategic targets.

The JSR presented a great opportunity not only to disseminate ideas and shifts in policy and planning, but also to garner inputs and dialogue from a wide range of stakeholders, helping to strengthen sector governance and participation in the policy cycle.

"The JSR also provides a good opportunity to discuss sector coordination, planning and monitoring issues, which can help in the ongoing work in establishing the SWAP," she said.

UNISWA taking legal route against owing students

THE University of Swaziland (UNISWA) will be taking the legal route against former students who are owing the tertiary institution.

The university had given the owing former students until August 31 to approach the institution and work out payment arrangements.

UNISWA Registrar Dr Salebona Simelane said the university tried to be lenient by sending out invitations to have the former students come forward so they iron out the issues of outstanding balances with the administration, but only a few ex-students came through.

"Less than 50 former students responded to the notice.

The university will now be taking legal actions against all those that owe," he said.

Simelane said those who owed the institution would be traced and they would honour their debt with the university.

He said UNISWA was owed a sizeable amount of money by former students and all efforts would be exhausted to have the money recovered.

Plantation workers brutally assaulted by cops ... The workers showed bruised and injured legs where they were physically between

ABOUT six striking **Plantation Forest Company** employees have been brutally assaulted by the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) Service.

The workers alleged they were severely assaulted by members of the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) after their strike on Friday

The workers displayed bruised and injured legs where they were physically battered by RSP members.

Of the injured workers, five were females and only one male who all were part of the striking Plantation workers.

Striking Plantation Workers Vice-Secretary Wendy Simelane said she suffered a double leg fracture and multiple tortures at the hands of three Royal Swaziland Police officers.

The names of the police are known to this publication but are withheld pending investigations.

Simelane was in the company of Thembisile Dlamini, Themba Dlamini, Cebsile Gadlela and Thembisile Khoza, who were all part of the striking Plantation workers.

They all claimed to have been assaulted by police who then warned them to keep silent, and not tell their story to anyone after taking them to the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital for treatment.

The workers were taken to a secluded location and were allegedly assaulted for starting the fires at the plantation grounds

They claimed to have been forced by police at the Pigg's Peak Police Station to write

statements claiming they started the fires.

Issue

Simelane also implicated Pigg's Peak station Commander Webster Methula in the issue.

According to Simelane, the main antagonists were two male police officers and a female police officer and after the beatings they were taken to the Pigg's Peak Police Station where two plain clothed policemen assaulted them and tortured them with water and plastics

Senior police officials, includ-

ing station commanders and commissioners from Mbabane, were reported to be talking to the administration of the striking Plantation workers in a closed meeting.

It was held at the Pigg's Peak Police Station. Chairperson of the striking Plantation workers Sibusiso Masuku, said the agenda of the meeting was to find out what really happened on Friday as news of the beatings had reached Mbabane.

Beatings

"The beatings and torture by the police is shocking and the details are being covered up yet workers have been assaulted and basic human rights violated," Masuku said.

The strike ended but the beatings and what happened on Friday are still under investiga-

Shiselweni Forestry Company vow not to honour DC

LOCKED out 140 employees of the Shiselweni Forestry Company who have been employed through a labour broker, NDZ Consulting Company, have vowed not to honour a letter inviting them for a disciplinary hearing which is expected to start before the week ends.

The employees, through a letter, had been slapped with various charges.

Reports are they are yet to take a decision whether to heed the invitation or

The employees said they consulted with their legal team which advised them against signing any documents related to the hearing.

The employees would be expected to appear in groups on different dates and the first group would appear before the DC today.

"Our lawyers, having heard about the DC letters, advised us not to sign anything. This means no one will be part of that hearing until we are advised otherwise by our lawyers," said some of the employees.

Last Friday, the employees were at the labour broker offices situated at Vilane Complex behind the Nhlangano Magistrate's Court building where they were served with the letters informing them about the hearing.

Another batch received its letters on Monday.

they were being recorded, the officers grabbed his phone and deleted everything on it.


They then took him to the police cells where he was detained over night.

Drunk, high pupils a handful for teachers

CARLETONVILLE - A pupil accused of killing another student, abandoned his bail in the Khutsong Magistrate's Court yesterday.

The 19-year-old, who is a Lesotho national, stopped his formal bail application because it had not been established if he was in the country legally.

He is in Grade 10 at Badirile High School in Khutsong, Carletonville, west of Johannesburg.

He was arrested on September 1 after he allegedly stabbed and killed fellow pupil, Sabelo Phahlindlela, 19, outside their school on the same day.

Earlier the suspect was linked to the Casanova gang, one of several youth criminal gangs in the area.

The gangs are more known for waging running turf battles against one another in the area. Meanwhile, the late Phahlindlela was identified as a member of the Creature gang.

Stabbed

He was stabbed once in the neck, after an altercation with the accused.

The two allegedly had an argument during school hours when the suspect, who was carrying a condom filled with water, and his attempt to throw it at someone was thwarted by Phahlindlela. The suspect allegedly threatened to teach Phahlindlela a lesson after school.

After school, the suspect and his gang allegedly waited for him at the school gate, when he approached he was attacked and stabbed. Phahlindlela, after he was stabbed and bleeding profusely, fled to the school's nursing room where he later lost his life.

The suspect is expected back in court on October 13. Sowetanlive

MINISTRY OF HEALTH CAPACITATED ON STAFFING CONVENTION

THE ministry of health, through support from the **World Health Organisation** (WHO), PEPFAR and CHAI, has completed and introduced the staffing norms.

These were then disseminated to stakeholders at Royal Swazi Spa Convention Centre on Tuesday.

The process of developing the staffing norms began in 2012 and has been a journey aimed at introducing the science of recruiting health professionals.

Staffing norms, alongside other important documents, would help to determine the number of workers required by each cadre (skill mix) for the health sector to carry out its mandate, which was to provide health services to the public.

The staffing norms would help the ministry of health to justify requests for new positions from the ministry of public service.

It would also be used for planning and prioritising on staff recruitment, staff deployment, training and performance moni-

of Health, said staffing norms provided information for human resources planning and management. Inform

"Whereas norms can be used to inform a variety of human resources decisions. These norms are specifically intended to guide the human resource planning and management decisions in the ministry," she said.

Dr Okello explained that the staffing norms used scientific methods, workload based norms, nurse and patient ratios as well as doctor and nurse ratios, which

were applied uniformly across the sector. Developing

She informed the gathering comprising officers from the ministry of public service and other stakeholders that when developing the staffing norms, they looked at 18 cadres including medical officers, medical specialists, single and double qualified nurses, nursing assistants, dental surgeons, dental therapists, radiographers, sonographers, darkroom attendants, pharmacy assistants, lab assistants and adherence support, to name but a

few. On that note, Ministry of Health Under Secretary Simon Kunene said during the three-day workshop, the stakeholders would be discussing some of the ministry's important documents which included the national health policy, the national health strategic plan, the establishment register, the human resources for strategic plan and the staffing norms.

He said as a ministry they were committed to making the work environment conducive for health workers in order to improve job satisfaction.

Meanwhile, Management Services Division (MSD) Director Maxwell Masuku, said he was pleased that the ministry of health has engaged themselves on a staffing norm, saying it makes the work of the public service much easier. Different health facilities were visited during the development of the staffing norms to ascertain the number of health workers in each one of them. The visited health facilities included, among others, Dvokolwako, Emkhuzweni, Matsanjeni, Sithobela and Nhlangano, Mankanyane, Pigg's Peak and Mbabane Government Hospitals, Siteki Public Health Unit and some clinics in the regions.

When called, Indvuna Yenkhundla Shadrack Mashaya denied such issue was discus in any of their meetings. Meanwhile, when approached for his side of the story, the senior regional officer whose name is withheld as investigations are still continuing, stated he did not recall denying anyone entrance into VIP.

He said, on the day in question; he had met with a number of people including those in high positions in society. "I don't remember humiliating anyone, I only explained the arrangement to this particular person," said the senior regional officer.

JUST two months after signing the European Union's (EU) Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA), Swaziland has finally put the ultimate stamp into the EPAs.

The country ratified the EPAs on August 26, congratulations there. And I am hopeful that the implementation of such will greatly benefit the people of Swaziland i.e small business will migrate to medium or bigger ones and employ more people. The EU with this latest development will continue working together with Swaziland to seize new opportunities for trade and the betterment of the country.

Infact EU has signed the EPA with other members of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) including Botswana, Lesotho, Mozambique, Namibia, and Swaziland.

Access

These states will have 100 percent free access to its market. Worthnoting is that this trade agreement includes an array of products that the EU wants. EU said the EPA agreement would liberalise about 9 600 products and all these products would enter EU duty free (quota) and this of course is not just a temporary trade agreement but a permanent one. We all want lifelong things.

The EU noted that the EPA, an outcome of a long negotiated process between the EU and the SADC partner countries, will allow all of Swaziland's products, except arms, to enter the European market duty and quota free as soon as the ratification process is completed and all the procedures are in place.

The other six members of the SADC region namely; the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Zambia and Zimbabwe, are negotiating Economic Partnership Agreements with the EU

as part of other regional groups, namely Central Africa or Eastern and Southern Africa.

Though there is Brexit, EU is still there and is composed of over 25 countries consisting of Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Republic of Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary and many others.

Signed The ratification of the EPA was done by the Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation,

Chief Mgwagwa Gamedze. Following this, government is expected to intensify empowerment especially on small and medium businesses and my appeal to the Small Enterprise and Development Company (SEDCO) is to wake up and smell the coffee.

The businesses cannot tap into such

an agreement if they do not know what it really entails, the Swaziland Standards Authority (SWASA) also must show face and simply affer the ideal standards and product requirements for the SMEs.

I believe the country has more to offer than sugar, therefore the benefits of the trade agreement will not be centralised, even Buhleni businesses for instance can tap-in.

Proponents of the EPAs noted that the EPA contained a large number of "safeguards" or safety valves.

EPA countries could activate these and increase the import duty in case imports from the EU increase so much or so quickly that they threaten to disrupt domestic production.

In an earlier interview, EU Ambassador to Swaziland Nicola Bellomo had said the EPAs were an opportunity for the country to consolidate its trade relations with the EU. He said there was a lot of potential in the country even beyond the sugar industry as that sector is well established.

"Then there is the meat industry which has different opportunities, I believe the EPA is the ideal platform to promote these sectors with the EU market.

Authorities

The EU expects Swaziland to ratify the treaty on time, I have tried to get some feedback from the authorities and was told everything is on track. the process is ongoing," the ambassador said.

However, he said they had not seen anything official adding that they reinforced their capacity on the EPAs. Bellomo said they organised workshops for all relevant stakeholders and it was a big success, the private sector was involved.

The ambassador congratulated Swaziland on ratifying this very important step in the EPA process and highlighted that there was need for wider implementation as soon as the agreement comes into force.

Bellomo also urged Swaziland to disseminate the benefits of EPA to the private sector for effective implemen-

However, 'marrying' the EU on the EPA also means, their companies will have access to the SADC market, Swaziland included. Our local goods and products will compete those that from EU and they are highly competitive thus we need SEDCO and SWASA to help us. We need to up our game so that we are not significantly affected by this. Well to me the EPA is one important opportunity, that we should all embrace and work hard to reap its good results!!!

IT is safe to say the global HIV and AIDS response owes much of its success to those that were infected with HIV at the advent of the epidemic, but chose not to die quietly in the privacy and anonymity of their homes but instead demanded their rights to

In those early years, prejudice and fear of a disease that was saidto lead to sure death, meant the first generation of people living with HIV (PLHIV) were faced with many human rights violations and were denied both basic human empathy and science-owing largely to the many myths and misconceptions about how one contracted the disease.

HIV was labelled all sorts of names: "A disease for the poor and hungry," said a sitting president; "A disease for the promiscuous," members of faith would claim; "A disease for the unworthy," the elite would purport; and, "A curse," African traditionalists would claim.

EARLY HIV ACTIVISM IN THE **GLOBAL RESPONSE**

The stigmatisation and ostracism eventually led to outrage and many of the newly-infected living in the first world (where they had previously enjoyed health rights) began to organise and demanded, with reasonable expectation, for their health rights to be met.

The early struggle by PLHIV was therefore based on the personal will to live in the absence of treatment as well as a belief that PLHIV as people had the legal and moral claim to non-discrimination, privacy, self-determination and justice.

Subsequently, early HIV activism was based on the human rights approach and largely demanded the right to access 'then' expensive medicines; the right to safety at work; the right to pursue parenthood; and the general right to pursue their life goals

As the impact of AIDS spread from the first world to the developing countries, including Swaziland, AIDS activism also took hold giving rise to national, regional and global networks of PLHIV. In neighbouring South Africa, Edwin Cameron, then a fruman fights 211 lawyer and now serving on the South African Constitutional Court, led the challenge for a law to confront the wave of stigma and discrimination that accompanied the rapidly growing HIV epidemic in that country.

Though diagnosed with HIV in 1986, Cameron publicly disclosed his HIV status in 1999 and by then, he had already founded the AIDS Consortium in 1992 and the AIDS Law Project in 1993.

The two organisations he founded helped change the HIV human rights landscape in South Africa. The most telling victory by a South African HIV activist to this day has been their successful full-on fight for government supported HIV

treatment which has seen South Africa become the country with the largest population of PLHIV who are on life saving treatment and receiving HIV grants.

At the global level, in 2003, activists both inside and outside of the World Health Organisation (WHO) pressured the agency to commit to the "3 by 5" initiative to provide three million PLHIV in low and middle-income countries with life-prolonging antiretroviral treatment (ART) by the end of 2005. This was a step towards their goal of universal access of HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment accessible for all who need them as a human right.

associated with being diagnosed with HIV and publicly disclosed their status Through the efforts of early activism led by the likes of Hannie Dlamini, Gcebile Ndlovu, Vusi Matsebula, Siphiwe Hlophe, and many others, the country was able to save some PLHIV in the absence of treatment of PLHIV. and to an extent, prevent the rapid

spread of HIV through awareness. These brave men and women, gave the disease the face of a human and Swaziland being as small as it is; the face was that of a relative, a friend, colleague and/or a partner.

They pioneered community peer to peer programmes which ensured that PLHIV, received moral and psychosocial support from each other, which led to the formation of PLHIV support groups - which eventually gave rise to the formation of a network, the Swaziland National Network of People Living with HIV and AIDS (SWAN-NEPHA). In the absence of treatment, PLHIV depended on Positive Living programmes coupled with lived-experiences of those who were willing to share their stories.

PLHIV were also instrumental in advocating for the introduction of ART in the country. The Swaziland AIDS Support Organisation (SASO) partnered with NERCHA and the Mbabane Clinic in piloting for the introduction of free ART in the country, with government hospitals following shortly in 2003. This was later followed by Treatment Literacy programmes which prepared PLHIV, their families and community at large for the roll-out of affordable and free treatment.

The treatment literacy programmes broke down what was complicated medical jargon to a language that could be understood by all in the society and chiefly the person living with HIV. These efforts increased uptake and adher-

ence to ART. To date there is no known disease that has seen such population level empowerment, with almost all Swazis having a general awareness of HIV and those living with HIV equipped with information to improve their health.

UNAIDS FAST-TRACK APPROACH

At the present moment, the country is faced with new possibilities contained in the 2016 United Nations Political Declaration to end the AIDS epidemic as a public threat by 2030.

The UNAIDS 2016-2021 strategy, that is localised through the Umgubudla Fast Track Programme Towards an AIDS-Free Swaziland, maps out the Global End AIDS Fast-Track approach (90.90.90 initiative) to reach critical HIV prevention and treatment targets and achieve zero discrimination. The approach practically means the following for Swaziland:

■ Ensuring that 90 percent of the people who are infected with HIV are diagnosed. Current estimates

show that 211 231 tests were performed in 2013 and projections require 244 946 PLHIV in 2020;

■ Getting 90 percent of those that are diagnosed to be on treatment with antiretroviral drugs. Currently, the ART coverage for adults aged 15 years and older is 68% of the 90.90.90 target but lower for children;

■ Having at least 90 percent of those on treatmentattain an undetectable level of HIV in their bodies (suppressed viral load). Unfortunately, in 2015, only pregnant women on ART who showed symptoms of treatment failure (targeted) were assessed for viral load. Of the 1 142 women on ART assessed for viral load, only 18% had an undetectable viral load.

For Swaziland, however, all this has to be done by 2022 as His Majesty King Mswati III has directed in the Vision 2022.

PLHIV CRUCIAL TO ENDING **AIDS**

An AIDS-Free Swaziland is one that still has people who are living with HIV but experience Zero new infections, Zero AIDS-related deaths and Zero Stigma. The role of HIV activists in getting the country there, cannot be overemphasised. The PLHIV movement has to lead the response from the front, middle and behind. From the front by enrolling and adhering to lifelong treatment; in the middle by being HIV prevention advocates through positive living; and from the back by backstopping government to ensure the quality of care remains the same (if not improved) and that stigma is eliminated.

Today and in the future, PLHIV will remain the true HIV heroes in the HIV response.

Our journey to end AIDS as a public health threat however requires we all re-engineer ourselves so that our actions resonate with the times we live in - a time where we have teenagers born with HIV, a period in which we are now asking people that look and feel well, to initiate in early treatment, and a period in our lives, where we need to start dealing with the longterm effects of treatment (ageing with HIV).

DON'T FEELTH REATENE BY BLACK PRIDE

WHITE South Africans should not feel threatened by or even be uncomfortable with the surge of black consciousness and black pride.

They - we, because I write this as a white South African male should rather try to understand where it comes from and what it

We shouldn't get all worked up when the 13-year-old Zulaikha Patel with her formidable afro and raised fist expresses herself strongly on what it's like to be a young black woman in a mostly white environment.

We should rather show respect to black teenagers who stand up and fight for their own dignity and that of their peers. We shouldn't overreact if black compatriots vent their feelings about blackness in strong terms and dish out a few klaps in our direction because they feel that white is still the norm in our soci-

It doesn't help when whites say things like "come on, apartheid was buried in 1994, snap out of it" or "get over your race obsession".

Or, in the case of schools and universities, "you knew in advance what the rules and demographics of these institutions were, and you still went there, what did you expect?"

Radical student movements can sometimes be irritating in their methods and their use of ideological jargon and quotes from longdead philosophers from elsewhere in the world, but we simply have to try and decode their words and accept that they represent widely felt frustrations among younger

black generations.

We whites should rather ponder how it happened that the black consciousness prophet Steve Biko is now, 39 years after his death, read and quoted more than at any time before.

How is it, we should ask, that the black youth still feel alienated and marginalised in a country with an overwhelming black majority and a mostly black government? I think we white South Africans should try harder to look beyond our own white middle class problems and perceived victimhood and acknowledge that our black compatriots had adjusted and compromised more than we did since 1994; that most of us are indeed still at the top of the food chain; that there are more than enough cause for black South Africans to firmly assert themselves.

Constitution

We whites love to call upon the bill of rights in the constitution to protect our own rights, but we tend to forget that the same document undertakes to "heal the divisions of the past and establish a society based on democratic values, social justice and fundamental human rights" and "improve the quality of life of all citizens and free the potential of each person." It also states: "Everyone has inherent dignity and the right to have their dignity respected and protected."

It is telling that black consciousness, which has been with us for well over four decades, is only blossoming two decades after we became a democracy. The BC-oriented parties, the PAC and Azapo, have disappeared from the scene.

The response of many whites here and elsewhere to the cry "Black Lives Matter" is that it should read "All Lives Matter".

The American civil rights activist Angela Davis had a clear response to this in her speech in Pretoria last week. "If all lives mattered, we would not proclaim that black lives

mattered," she said. The statement does imply that all lives matter, including women's lives, LBGT people's lives, Muslim lives, indigenous people's lives, white working class lives; but to substitute it with 'all lives" would presuppose that "we somehow magically transcended race", she said.

It cannot be denied that much of the lack of development and progress in South Africa since 1994 can be blamed on the ineptness, corruption, cronyism and maladministration of successive ANC governments. This is especially true of the criminal neglect of the education given to black youth in townships, squatter camps and deep rural areas and of historically black universities.

But this doesn't tell the whole story of the resurgence of black consciousness and isn't a valid argument to use to discredit it.

Too many of us whites behave as if the slate was wiped clean in 1994 and as if there was a 50/50 division between black and white, "them" and "us"

The Afrikaner historian Hermann Giliomee reminded us last week in a controversial piece on the legacy of Hendrik Verwoerd that "demography is destiny" was the one dictum that has always applied in his-

We whites are so obsessed with our "minority rights" and the socalled "injustice" of black economic empowerment and affirmative action that we lose perspective and fail to see the bigger picture of the entire South African nation.

Black South Africans clearly experience this as selfishness, arrogance and racism.

It is in everybody's interest, certainly also in the interests of the white minority, that black South Africans feel confident, empowered, recognised and respected. Until that happens, there will be a lot of anger, frustration and even instability and whites will increasingly feel under siege.

If that means that we whites have to be more sensitive, understand better and sometimes listen rather than speak, then that is what we have to do.

We have to realise that if we have a more just and egalitarian society, there would be much less motivation for race-based assertiveness. That is something we middle class whites can help achieve.

IZE IMPORTATION RESTRICTION IOW AT 50KG PER HOUSEHOLI

GOVERNMENT has increased the mealie-meal importation restriction from 20kg to 50kg per household.

Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati made the announcement yesterday during a press conference held at the ministry of agriculture offices in Mbabane.

"On behalf of the ministry and the government, in line with Section 37 of the Constitution, His Majesty's Government has seen it proper to review restrictions of the import and export of mealiemeal as an interim measure in alleviating the drought problem," he said.

Vilakati said the change would apply for the next three months with effect from yesterday to December 2016, wherein the next review would be considered to fully assist and support the affected communities.

Vilakati said the interim measure would only be applicable to individuals representing house-

holds and requires them to apply for a permit from the National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBoard). He said the permits would be obtainable at strategic border posts.

"Following the prevailing drought situation, we have observed that some areas have been severely affected to the extent that the concerted efforts by His Majesty's Government, through various agencies, such as the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA)

and civil society, have not yielded the desired assistance.

As such, we have been inundated with serious concerns, especially from areas next to the borders, where people complain that the restriction in importing mealie-meal into the country is undesirable and is threatening their lives something which has a negative impact on the government's efforts in mitigating the hunger problem," he said.

The minister said government was open to relevant suggestions that could assist in the effects of the food security issue.

He thanked all millers who have continued to support the communities with mealie-meal at competitive prices during this period.

"We have been informed that millers have committed themselves to continuously deliver mealie-meal to all stricken areas at competitive prices during this period," he said.

Members of the public voiced their dissatisfaction about the maize import restrictions during the recently held people's parliament or Sibaya. This newspaper also reported that members of parliament had also cried foul over the 20kg restriction.

According to the ministry of agriculture production outlook 2016, maize yields were estimated to drop to 33 460 metric tonnes for the cropping season resulting in a deficit of about 96 540 metric tonnes. This reflects a supply squeeze going forward until at least the next harvesting season.

Visible trade imports down by 8.4%

VISIBLE trade imports of the country have decreased by 8.4 percent to stand at E4.4 billion for the first quarter of the year.

Latest trade statistics obtained from the Central Bank of Swaziland June quarterly report state that the total visible exports by the country amounted to E5.4 billion.

The CBS said the country continued to experience a trade surplus for the first quarter of the year amounting to just under E1 billion.

"This represents a 35.2 percent decrease compared to the previous quarter," reads the report in part.

The fall in visible imports comes at a time when the debate of reviewing trade policies comes to light.

The visible balance is that part of the balance of trade figures that refers to international trade in physical goods, but not trade in services.

At the recently held Swaziland International Trade Fair (SITF) there were questions raised around trade policies of the coun-

Bulembu Ministries Enterprise Manager Kurt Puttkammer in his presentation proposed trade restrictions to protect locally produced goods against the competitiveness of imports from neighbouring South Africa.

"Swaziland should consider imposing import restrictions or taxes on products that can successfully be produced locally.

Success story

"A success story of this is the honey industry, after import restrictions were enforced Swaziland producers were able to service the local market increasing job opportunities and gross domestic product," he said.

This view on trade policy was further echoed by the Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority (SIPA) Chief Executive Officer Phumelele Dlamini, who said the issue of trade policy was very critical.

Dlamini said trade policy was

influenced by the Southern Africa Customs Union (SACU), and one wonders if there was room for the trade policy of the region to be reviewed so as to safe guard infant industries in the country.

These sentiments were shared by some of the people who were in attendance during the question and answer session.

One participant said the issue of trade policy was a pertinent one and needs to be addressed by the government so that small businesses in Swaziland can thrive.

"The playing ground is unequal such that it is difficult to compete with products that are imported from South Africa as they are competitive."

AFRICAN ALLIANCE APPLAUDS SSX AUTOMATION

AFRICAN Alliance Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Nelisiwe Mabuza-Mkhabela has applauded the automation initiative by the Swaziland Stock Exchange (SSX).

"We look forward to a more seamless process, as well as increased activity on the SSX," she said.

Mabuza-Mkhabela said the move from manual to automated trading was a huge and commendable step for the SSX.

"We believe this will serve to make trading more efficient, easier and faster, as well as allow for fluidity and ease of transfers," she said.

The CEO said the automation effectively means that potential traders (buyers) would always be directly and independently aware of shares which would be up for sale, since the seller will be able to load onto the system whenever they have shares that they would like to offload, without having to always go through a broker

"It will further eliminate a lot of paperwork and the need for brokers to physically go to the SSX whenever they need to trade," she said.

Mabuza-Mkhabela said another advantage is the settlement of trades done on the exchange.

"They have also promised that the automation will shorten the time of settlement from five to three days, allowing sellers to receive the monies sooner than they do currently," she said.

The SSX has advised that the system would also be accessible from mobile phones which makes it easier to trade even from the comfort of your house.

Mabuza-Mkhabela said this would likely make it easier for the average person to access financial instruments on the exchange, such as shares also known as equity and bonds.

She said the automation would also allow external traders easier access to the exchange, as well as link the exchange to the rest of live countries on the system.

Asked which other initiatives the SSX could initiate to improve the capital markets of the country, she suggested that SSX should consider to educate the market on the value add that an exchange has to businesses and individuals alike, "in terms for value, being a conduit to access capital for business growth through listings and a very lucrative investment hub," she said.

SwaziBank receives accolades for supporting financial education





MTN RAISES MORE THAN R18BN IN LOANS

JOHANNESBURG - MTN Group [JSE:MTN], Africa's largest mobile-phone operator by sales, said it entered three loan agreements, raising more than \$1.3bn (R18.64bn) as the company markets a potential bond.

The company is being provided with \$1 billion and R4.8bn (\$332 million) from local and international banks and financial institutions, Johannesburg-based MTN said in an e-mailed response to questions on Tuesday.

MTN is on a roadshow in the US and UK this week to gauge investor appetite for the sale of debt securities.


"These financing arrangements are in line with the MTN's funding strategy, which aims to improve its debt maturity structure on an ongoing basis and maintain adequate bank facility headroom to support its credit rating," the company said.

"MTN's funding strategy further aims to maintain a balance of operating currency and dollardenominated debt."

MTN's move to attract funding

comes after the company reported its first-ever half-year loss in August, partly caused by an agreement to settle a record 330 billion naira (\$1 billion) fine in Nigeria. MTN and its subsidiaries have \$3.2bn of debt and interest payments due by the end of July next year, according to data compiled by Bloomberg.

That includes a \$2.75bn bridgeterm loan, a R2bn senior unsecured loan and R1.25bn of bonds, the data shows. Two loan deals were signed on August 25, according to data compiled by Bloomberg. A facility for \$250m matures in 2019 and a \$750m agreement closes in 2021, the data show. In both instances, the agent for the facilities was Citigroup's global markets unit, which was also a joint book runner along with Bank of America Merrill Lynch. The lead arrangers for the credit included units of Barclays Africa Group, Mizuho Bank, Societe Generale and State Bank of India. There were 10 lenders in total, according to the data. They included Bank of Tokyo-Mitsubishi, JPMorgan Chase, Standard Chartered and Sumitomo Mitsui Banking.

MTN's subscriber base of 233 million didn't grow during the six months through June and the company is struggling to repatriate R15.4bn tied up in its Iranian unit. "The process of repatriating money out of Iran has been more complex than we initially thought, with Iran not having ties with international banks," MTN's outgoing Chief Financial Officer Brett Goschen said at the company's first-half results presentation on August 5. "Every week we are getting a little bit closer, but it will take us at least five to six months to get the money out once we start the first tranche." MTN hopes to start moving the funds out of Iran during the first half of 2017, according to Goschen. He will leave at the end of the month and a successor has yet to be appointed, "MTN remains confident of its ability to remit monies in the short to medium term, and is currently on a process of putting in place the appropriate governance structures to facilitate the repatriation of funds," the company said on Tuesday.

Nic Rudnick, CEO of Liquid Telecom, told Fin24 that the parties could comment on the timelines which remain within the control of the regulator and the Competition Commission.

"We are hopeful that, with all due process, the applications will be dealt with as speedily as possible and ideally before the close of the calendar year," he said.

Kennedy Memani, who is acting as Neotel CEO, told Fin24 the next steps will be to submit the transaction to ICASA (Independent Communications Authority of South Africa), the Competition Commission and then the Competition Tribunal for approval.

The acquisition by Liquid Telecom came after Tata Communications announced it would sell its controlling stake in the company.

"The acquisition will create the largest pan-African broadband network and B2B telecoms provider spanning 12 countries from South Africa to Kenya with further expansion planned," Memani told Fin24.

Memani is acting in place of former CEO Sunil Joshi, who resigned after an investigation in August 2015 by the board of the company cleared him of bribery. *Fin24*

Deal or no deal, OPEC's freeze talks already succeeding

LONDON - Even as speculation builds over whether the members of the Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) will clinch an output deal with Russia this month, their negotiations are already paying off.

Hedge funds and other investors reversed their bets on falling oil prices at the fastest pace in five months after producers said they would meet in Algiers, data from the US Commodity Futures Trading Commission show.

While scepticism has grown about whether the OPEC, whose representatives held a flurry of meetings from Moscow to Paris last week, can overcome internal conflicts, speculative short positions in US crude are still 41% below their August peak.

Production

Oil climbed as much as 16% in the weeks after OPEC announced talks in the Algerian capital, extending a rebound from a four-month low.

While the desire of Iran and Iraq to boost output prompted doubts there will be a deal, crude has held much of the gain, just as prices retained their initial boost from the previous failed attempt to freeze production in Doha in April.

"The best they can do is alert short-sellers that, if they really are pushed, they can take a few barrels away," Jan Stuart, global energy economist at Credit Suisse Securities in New York, said by e-mail.

"That changes the risk-reward calculation for investors, and the record short position of just a few weeks ago is unwound and becomes more neutral."

Money managers slashed their short positions in West Texas Intermediate crude by 124 819 contracts, in the three weeks to August 30, the biggest percentage pullback for such a space of time since late March, according to data from the Commodity Futures Trading Commission.

Big SA banks doing exceptionally well - PwC

JOHANNESBURG – South Africa's major banking groups reported solid results for the first half of the year, delivering value to shareholders which compares favourably to European counterparts, according to PwC Africa.

PwC published its analysis on the results of the six months to end-June 2016 for the following banks: Barclays Africa Group Limited [JSE:BGA], FirstRand [JSE:FSR], Nedbank [JSE:NED] and Standard Bank [JSE:SBK] yesterday. "It is exceptional that our banks have

been able to increase operating income by what they have in the last six months," said Johannes Grosskopf, financial ser-

leader for PwC
Africa. "Banks
are finding it difficult to navigate in the
current macro-economic environment.
What we see happening in the macro-eco-

nomic environment comes through in

results."
The banks posted combined headline earnings of R34.6bn - up 5.7% compared to the same period in 2015. Total operating income lifted 13.3% and operating expenses rose 12.6%.

"Banks are doing exceptionally well in terms of delivering shareholder value. They still deliver value to shareholders," said Grosskopf. This is measured by the economic spread between the return on equity (ROE) and the cost of equity.

Linde fires CFO after merger talks with Praxair fail

FRANKFURT – German industrial gas company Linde on Tuesday announced the immediate departure of its chief financial officer after he was singled out for blame over the firm's failed merger talks with US giant Praxis.

Linde shares closed up more than 4.6 percent on news of Georg Denoke's dismissal, which came a day after Linde said a deal to create the world's largest industrial gas supplier had been abandoned.

"Georg Denoke will leave the management board of Linde AG, effective today," the firm said in a statement.

His duties as CFO will be handled by Linde's Head of Group Treasury, Sven Schneider, until a successor is appointed, it added. Linde said the tie-up talks with Praxair had been halted after "discussions about details, specifically about governance aspects, did not result in a mutual understanding". News24





NIGERIA'S LARGEST AIRLINE GROUNDED, THOUSANDS STRANDED

LAGOS - Thousands of passengers across Africa have been left stranded after Nigeria's largest airline said Tuesday it had suspended operations and might remain grounded for several days.

Arik Air attributed the "temporary disruption" to "pending approval of aircraft documentation related to insurance renewal... a challenge due to the long weekend holidays" for the Muslim feast of Eid al-Adha. Two other Nigerian carriers, Aero and First Nation, also sus-

pended flights this month.

A dire shortage of dollars, linked to the drop in the price of oil, which accounts for 70 percent of Nigeria's economy, has drastically reduced banks' liquidity and left the country's airlines unable to pay their bills.

JUBA - A report commissioned by actor-activist
George Clooney alleging
massive corruption and war
profiteering by leaders of
South Sudan, the world's
newest nation, is "completely rubbish," the government
said.

A spokesperson for President Salva Kiir said the report released in Washington at a high-profile press conference headed by Clooney was "misleading" and ill-intentioned.

The result of a two-year inquiry, the report details how Kiir and his former deputy umed rebel leader Riek Machar - who is currently in Khartoum receiving medical treatment - profited largely from a three-year conflict that has driven 2.5 million people from their homes and left half the population dependent on food aid to survive.

The "key catalyst" of the war was "competition for the grand prize - control over state assets and the country's abundant natural resources," notably its oil, it said.

"The report itself is completely rubbish," said Wek.

'Allow Mugabe to exercise his freedom of expression'

HARARE - President Robert Mugabe's critics say he denies them freedom of expression but what about allowing the longtime president the right to exercise his?

That's the contorted argument being put forward in the star letter of Tuesday's Herald newspaper in Zimbabwe - and it demonstrates the lengths to which Mugabe supporters will go to defend a leader who is coming under the kind of pressure he's never previously seen during his 36 years in power.

Reacting to widespread criticism from activists at the president's attack on the judiciary earlier this month, letter-writer 'John Sigauke' says Mugabe, 92, merely "expressed his opinion" and was exercising his own right to freedom of expression.

"President Mugabe still has a constitutional right to freedom of expression and opinion. He is still a human being like anybody else," the letter reads.

Earlier this month, Mugabe said Zimbabwe judges who'd given the go-ahead to protests were "negligent" and "reckless". Churches and opposition officials have demanded he retract those statements.


There has long been a suspicion that Herald letters are written in-

house or at least by members of Mugabe's Central Intelligence Organisation (CIO), since all printed correspondence to the paper reflects its overwhelmingly pro-Mugabe stance.

A quick Google search for 'John Sigauke' shows he's crossed swords with reporters in the private press before. He is also named as the author of pro-ZANU-PF columns on local news website Bulawayo24.

"Being a president of Zimbabwe... does not take away the president's rights to express his personal opinion," says 'Sigauke'.

Somalia lifts ban on Kenyan imports

MOGADISHU - Somalia on Tuesday agreed to lift a week-old ban on imports of Kenyan khat after a storm of controversy from angry growers of the leafy narcotic in neighbouring Kenya. EFF BLACKMAILS DA COUNCILS, THREATENS TO 'PUT IT ON NOTICE'

TSHWANE - The EFF's acting provincial chairperson reminded the DA that it had to get her party's vote to be able to run Jo'burg and Tshwane.

The Democratic Alliance's (DA) power in Tshwane and Johannesburg might be hanging in the balance. This after the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) in Gauteng vowed yesterday to "put the DA on notice" should the party fight land invasions, a programme adopted by the Red Berets in 2014.

Speaking to The Citizen yesterday, the EFF's acting provincial chairperson Mandisa Mashego reminded the DA that it had to get her party's vote to be able to run both cities of Johannesburg and Tshwane.

During last month's local government elections, the ANC and the DA did not get the required 51% vote in both cities and as a result, coalitions were formed. The EFF made it clear that it was never going to enter into any coalition with the ANC, but opted to give its votes to the DA, a party it described as the "better devil".

Commenting further on the land

grabs issue, Mashego said no one, including the DA, would stand in their way.

"White people are the ones who stole the land in 1652 and not in 1912 when the ANC was formed. "Jan van Riebeeck landed

here and grabbed our land, but we are told we must just move on... that

just move on... that will never happen," Mashego said. She said the EFF has embarked on 20 successful pro-

grammes.

"Most of the invasions have taken place in Tshwane in either privately-owned pieces of land ... and in some of the areas some people are still trying to move in.

"The ANC tried before to stop us with rubber bullets and the Red Ants and we are saying to the DA, try that with us, we will end your occupation of council ... remember, you (DA) did not get outright majority wins

from the elections," Mashego said.

She said the EFF and ordinary members of the public have been working together on the programme in areas such as Sedibeng,
Ekurhuleni, Johannesburg and

Tshwane.

"The DA will never liberate our people while the ANC has failed black people for many

years, hence we never entered into any coalition agreement ... we did not give our

votes to the ANC but chose to give them to the racists," she said.

Asked if he was not worried about the EFF's threats, DA provincial leader John Moodey responded: "It is the EFF's prerogative to decide what they do with their votes."

According to political analyst professor Andre Duvenhage, the ANC is likely to adopt a more radical approach through mass mobilisation in an attempt to disrupt the DA in delivering services. This could include land grabs. *News24*

Bank that granted Zuma loan not sharing any details

JOHANNESBURG - The CEO of VBS Mutual Bank from whom President Jacob Zuma received a loan to help him pay back R7.81m for non-security upgrades at his Nkandla home says no details of the loan will be made public.

In an exclusive interview on Power FM's Power Business show, VBS Mutual Bank CEO Andile Ramavhunga said the scrutiny that has followed the news of the bank loaning Zuma the money had caught him offguard.

"We did expect a bit of publicity, but the publicity we have received in the past two days has just been overwhelming. Some of it negative, some of it

positive."

The bank has been in operation since 1982 and started with a customer base of residents from the then republic of Venda as clients, specialising in home loans.

When asked about what details could be shared regarding the transaction with Zuma, Ramavhunga said that he could say "pretty much nothing" due to client confidentiality clauses.

He denied that political influence played any part in the bank granting Zuma the loan.

According to Ramavhunga, the bank has approved more than R300m worth of similar loans to other South Africans. *News24*

Zama-Zamas retrieve last two bodies from Langlaagte mine

JOHANNESBURG Twenty-two volunteer

Twenty-two volunteer rescue workers had to endure a long night as they miraculously retrieved the bodies of the last two miners that were still trapped underground at the Langlaagte mine.

Chairperson of the Zimbabwe Community in South Africa Ngqabutho Mabhena, who was on the scene and spoke on behalf of the surrounding community, said it was no easy task retrieving the bodies.

Volunteer rescue workers had been searching for the bodies for several days. Mabhena said the team of volunteers could only find a hole with a 30cm opening and believed they had reached a dead-end.

"They [rescue workers] couldn't access that hole, because of
all the heavy equipment that
they were carrying," Mabhena
said. The team had to breach the
hole without most of their
equipment. "The team don't
have any special equipment on
them, they only have headlights
and the sticks they find underground."

No more freebies - Tshwane mayor


PRETORIA – The new Tshwane council has started a review of exemptions from rates and services billing that the previous ANC administration is alleged to have handed out, Mayor Solly Msimanga's office said on Tuesday.

"It cannot be that debt owed to the City of Tshwane by other arms of government goes unpaid any longer," acting mayoral spokesperson Matthew Gerstner said.

Msimanga would expose these debtors and demand full payment at the end of the review he was conducting. Tshwane needed to collect debts to improve service delivery, he said.

Gerstner was responding to claims the EFF had made that provincial and national government departments, the ANC's provincial offices and its Luthuli House headquarters in Johannesburg had not been paying for basic services such as water and electricity for years.

The EFF accused the former mayors of Tshwane and Johannesburg - Kgosientso Ramokgopa and Parks Tau - of shielding the ANC government as some departments had allegedly not paid utility bills for over five years. Johannesburg Mayor Herman Mashaba's spokesperson Tony Taverna-Turisan said the ANC had brought its Luthuli House bill up

to date, paying R1 million on September 2. The mayor will also revisit the billing crisis that once plagued the city through the establishment of a billing Indaba.

The Gauteng government has expressed concern over the EFF's statement, stating that it had made a commitment to address challenges around billing and unpaid municipal rates as far back as 2011. In a written response, it said it put systems in place to support municipalities in dealing with the issues, including the creation of a debt committee.

"It functions as the first port of call between the department and municipalities in cases where there are disputes over the disconnection of municipal services because of out-

standing debts," explained the premier's spokesperson Phumla Sekhonyane. She said there have been significant improvements in efforts to fast track government debt since the establishment of the committee. She also noted that the Finance MEC Barbara Creecy had set aside funds for this, growing from R300 million in the 2012/2015 financial year to R334 million for 2015/2016. The EFF called for an investigation into the accounts of government departments and the ANC. "And if it is found that indeed the defaults have been protected illegally, the two former mayors must be called to account and charged where applicable," the EFF said in a state-

NORTH KOREA - Dozens of outraged tourists have slammed North Korea's only six-star hotel for its 'prison-like' conditions, online.

The Ryanggang Hotel in

Pyongyang - which is described by
locals as a 'first class' establishment
- has received 31 reviews on Trip
Advisor, with the majority of
tourists giving it big thumbs down.

But for tourists seeking an alternative luxury accommodation, the capital's other premier hotel, Kim Jong Un's swanky 1 082ft-high Ryugyong Hotel, remains unopened, 29 years after the project began.

Simon Ryder from Wirral,
Merseyside, who booked a room at
Ryanggang Hotel in May 2012,
wrote: "The beds are so hard I think
the floor was more comfortable... I
flushed the toilet and my feet got a
wash."

Another guest from Cape Town, South Africa, echoed Mr Ryder's sentiments, writing: "Classic Soviet style hotel. Dismal, poorly lit, rock hard beds, miserable food, and intermittent hot water - and these are the good points!"


However, looking on the bright side, the traveller concluded that the hotel stay was all part of the 'North Korean experience'.

David Templeman from Estonia merely described the Ryanggang as 'old and cold'.

Talking about the electrics, he wrote: "The electric wiring is in a really poor state. Half of power sockets are broken, and there's bare (and possibly live) wires coming out of the floor and just end abruptly."

He continued, with a touch of humour: "But on the plus side, there was a huge flat-screen TV with one

channel: the North Korean propaganda channel, where the female narrator tries her best to sound upbeat while clips of Kim Jong Un and some fields and buildings show"

There is no word on how much rooms at the Ryanggang Hotel go for and there is no website for the husiness

Many guests said they booked while being led around the city on a tour.

Overall the Ryanggang emerges with a rating of 2.5 out of five on TripAdvisor, with the majority of reviewers marking it 'average' or 'poor'.

In North Korea it appears that luxury hotels are lacking.

For years, visitors have been anticipating the opening of Kim Jongun's swanky 1 082ft-high Ryugyong

However, the pyramid-like glass and steel building which has apparently cost more than \$750millon (£565million) to construct, remains unopened.

Work actually began in 1987 under the regime of Kim Jong-un's grandfather, Kim Il-sung, and was meant to open two years later as a calculated snub to neighbouring South Korea.

As Seoul hosted the 1988.

Olympics, North Korea would open what would then have been the world's tallest hotel.

The structure of the mighty pyramid was quickly completed, but work came to a shuddering halt in 1992 after the collapse of Pyongyang's benefactor, the Soviet Union.

It was an economic disaster for North Korea and provoked a devastating famine that killed up to 3.5million people.

So what was supposed to have been a towering symbol of the country's technical mastery instead became an idle landmark which has attracted international ridicule.

An inspection by a European delegation in the nineties concluded that the shell was irreparable and it should be torn down because of its poor-quality concrete and crooked elevator shafts.

Esquire magazine described it as 'the worst building in the history of mankind'. Others labelled it the Hotel of Doom. The name has stuck.


In 2008, after 16 years of inactivity and to the astonishment of Western observers, work suddenly resumed.

Then in 2011 its concrete was strengthened and its exterior coated in £111million worth of glass, which dazzles when it catches the sun.

Its fortunes were further revived by the deep-pocketed Egyptian Orascom Group which took over as developer in 2008 after reportedly signing a \$400 million deal to establish a mobile phone network in North Korea.

Orascom were responsible for installing the glass panels along with a telecom antennae.

Anti-radicalisation centre to open

PARIS - The veil has been lifted on what is billed as France's first centre to prevent those on the road to radicalisation from becoming extremists. Officials said on Tuesday that the centre in a small town in western France would take in a half-dozen volunteers without a judicial history by month's end. The centre is to be the model for others and will hold a maximum of 25 people, aged between 18 and 30, who will stay in the converted domain for up to 10 months.

Saved women meets rescuer

DENHAM SPRINGS - Millions of people have seen and shared the video of a good Samaritan jumping off a boat to rescue Hailey Brouillette and her dog from a car sinking into south Louisiana floodwaters last month. Brouillette isn't one of them, but she finally got to meet the man who saved her life. Although she heard David Phung's voice during the rescue, Brouillette never saw her rescuer's face before their reunion on Monday at a Denham Springs home where she is temporarily staying.

China warms Taiwan on Dalai Lama

BELJING - China yesterday warned Taiwan's new government against allowing exiled Tibetan spiritual leader the Dalai Lama to visit, after a high-profile Taiwanese legislator invited him to the self-ruled island that Beijing claims as its own. China regards the 80-year-old monk as a separatist. Taiwan's former president Ma Ying-jeou, who favoured closer economic ties with China, refused the Dalai Lama entry several times since his last visit to Taiwan in 2009. On that occasion Ma did allow him in, but did not meet him. Reuters

weekly Charlie Hebdo says the cartoons that offended a quake-hit Italian town are standard fare for the paper's signature "black humour". Riss, also a cartoonist, said in a radio interview on Tuesday that the weekly isn't concerned by a defamation complaint brought by Amatrice, where most of the 295 killed in the August 24 earthquake lived. The town is famous for its tomato sauce and one Charlie Hebdo cartoon depicted victims in layers of lasagne. AP

UN Syria envoy hails ceasefire

GENEVA - The UN's Syria envoy on Tuesday applianced a fall in violence through the first 24 hours of a fragile ceasefire but said security concerns meant aid convoys had not yet deployed. Staffan de Mistura told reporters that the powers which brokered the truce - the United States and Russia - would likely provide a full assessment of the pact in the coming days or hours.

OBAMA SAYS TRUMP IS NO FRIEND OF THE WORKING CLASS

PHILADELPHIA - With Hillary Clinton sidelined by pneumonia, President Barack Obama took up the Democrats' fight against Donald Trump on Tuesday, trying to quash the Republican presidential candidate's bid to appeal to workingclass voters.

Obama, whose 50 percent job approval rating could help improve the climate for the Democratic ticket in the November 8 election, rallied party faithful against Trump, the 70-year-old New York real estate developer, at an outdoor event in Philadelphia.

"This is a guy who spent 70 years on this earth showing no concern for working people. He spent most of his life trying to stay far away from working peo-


ple. He wasn't going to let you on his golf course," Obama said.

Obama's campaign appearance was his first as a solo act on behalf of Clinton as he tries to ensure Democrats retain control of the White House once his eight years are over in January.

The president lauded new census numbers on income growth as proof that his administration's policies have helped improve the economy, an attempt to undermine Trump's argument that economic woes are deep.

"By so many measures, America is stronger and more prosperous than when we started out on this journey together," Obama said. Clinton, who was Obama's secretary of state during his first term, rested at her home in the New York City suburb of






THE PROLETARIAN AND BOURGEOIS: President Barack Obama and Presidential hopeful Donald Trump.

Strongest typhoon of the year hits Taiwan

TAIPEI - Parts of Taiwan were brought to a standstill yesterday as the strongest typhoon of the year skirted past the island's southern tip, knocking out power for more than 180 000 households.

Although super typhoon Meranti did not make landfall, the storm brought record strong winds and torrential rains to eastern and southern Taiwan.

At 02:15 GMT, Meranti was 30km southwest of southernmost Hengchun township, packing gusts of up to 263km/h.

Hengchun's observation station recorded the strongest winds in its 120-year history earlier yesterday, according to Taiwan's Central Weather Bureau.

"Meranti will have its most significant impact on Taiwan today," said forecaster Hsieh Peiyun.

Television footage showed flooded streets and violent winds in southern Kenting, a tourist destination known for its whitesand beaches.

School and work were cancelled for most eastern and southern counties while trains running along the east coast have been halted - affecting travel for the Mid-Autumn Festival long weekend which starts today.

The storm is expected to dump as much as 800 millimetres of rain in mountainous areas, poten-

tially triggering landslides. Close to 1 500 people have

Close to 1 500 people have been evacuated from at-risk areas, with about half in temporary shelters, according to the Central Emergency Operation Centre.

Meranti was moving northwest into the Taiwan Strait at 18km/h. Another storm brewing east of

the Philippines may also affect Taiwan later this week. The weather bureau's Hsieh

The weather bureau's Hsieh said tropical storm Malakas was expected to be closest to the island tomorrow and Saturday, but was unlikely to make landfall.

Zika funding's already spent in US: Doctors

MIAMI – Money to fight the spread of Zika virus in the US is "essentially all spent", top US doctors said on Tuesday, urging Congress to come to agreement on new funding measures.

The US and its territories have recorded more than 19 600 Zika infections, and Florida is seeing a rise in locally transmitted cases of the virus which is particularly dangerous for pregnant women because it can cause microcephaly, an irreversible deformation of the brain and skull, in infants. Already, 18 babies have been born with Zika-related birth defects in the US, said Beth Bell, director of the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Center for Emerging and Zoonotic Infectious Diseases. However, a \$1.1-billion (R15. 88bn) funding bill was rejected last week for the third time by US Senate Democrats, after Republicans inserted language that would end funding for a major abortion provider, Planned Parenthood. In a conference call with reporters on Tuesday, leading doctors from the CDC, the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and the American Academy of Pediatrics warned that critical elements of the public health response and research on vaccines may come to a halt by month's end. Igesund in the dark over top position

CAPE TOWN - A matter of six weeks ago it was widely suggested that Gordon Igesund, the PSL's most successful coach with four Premier League titles to his credit with four different clubs, was poised to become Zambia's new national coach.

Since then, instead of the deal being concluded, a deafening silence emerged regarding what had been suggested was close to a done deal.

Now, in a development more curious even than SAFA's handling of the Bafana Bafana situation, the Zambian FA on Tuesday announced the appointment of former Kaizer Chiefs striker Wedson Nyirenda as both the assistant and acting coach, while remaining mum on a permanent choice for the pivotal coaching post.

Igesund, for his part, has lately been as difficult to contact as the elusive Hollywood actress, Greta Garbo was in her heyday, while the normally flamboyant coach's agent, Mike Makaab, has been as equally evasive and noncommittal.

And, apart for anything else, the Zambian coaching position might not at this moment appear as attractive as it initially seemed, with the job, in fact, taking on the guise of a poisoned chalice for anyone who will eventually take it on.

The reason? The first task of the new Zambian coach will be to guide the national team to success in the coming 2018 World Cup qualifiers - with Zambia engulfed in what could rightly be termed a "Group of Death", with the three other teams competing for one place in Russia consisting of Nigeria, Algeria and Cameroon.

Indeed Zambia's opening World Cup qualifying game in little more than three weeks is against Nigeria - not an ideal time for the new coach to take over.

Makaab, however, says Igesund's discussions with the Zambian Football Federation are still in the pipeline and that only political complications related to the country's elections may have delayed finality.



SOCCER – THE MTN National First Division clash pitting Matsapha United against Madlenya will now be played tomorrow night.


