IN THE WAKE OF JUDGE MUMCY'S RULING ON LATE PHAKAMA'S 4 WIVES:

udzidzini Council
Secretary Chief
Dambuza Lukhele has
called upon parliamentarians to
adjust the country's laws, particularly those of marriages, to be
in line with the Swazi traditional
way of life.


Lukhele's call finds its basis in Section 34 (2) of the Constitution which states: "Parliament shall, as soon as practical after the commencement of this Constitution, enact legislation regulating the property rights of spouses including common-law husband and wife.

He made this call in reference to High Court Judge Mumcy Dlamini's last week nullification of three other marriages of former public transport operator Richard Themba Dlamini of Phakama Bus Service after his first wife, Sarah, whom he married through civil rites ran to court seeking an order to declare those marriages null and void.

Lukhele observed that this was a burning issue, highlighting that enlightened Swazis not showing others the rightful Swazi traditional way is what has exacerbated such matters in the country.

He said what was annoying is that such cases are growing where marriages are questioned in court after the husband is dead instead of doing such while he is still alive.

CHIEF DAMBUZA CALLS FOR REVIEW OF MARRIAGE LAWS



REVIEW: Ludzidzini Council Secretay Chief Dambuza Lukhele has called for a review on marriage laws.

He said most of the cases are motivated by materialism where there are battles for the deceased's estate amongst the remaining wives and sometimes children.

Cultures

Lukhele noted that the current situation is a result of the country's former colonial masters who came with their western cultures and infused them into Swazis.

"They are now gone, but as Swazis we have not gone back to re-direct the way we should live. We have our own Constitution now, but it has not fully tackled the issue of marriages as it gave parliament a directive to solve this issue when it was adopted back in 2005, but such has still not happened. The laws that are needed to direct us as Swazis have not been fully enacted hence the current situation we often find ourselves in," he said.

The Chief went on to argue that in western culture it is

unlawful to take another way through the very same civil rites, but observed that the argument that then ensues in the Swazi way of doing things and has not yet been solved is what then happens if one then elects to take another wife through Swazi law and custom.

"Fundamentally it is a problem that is not only facing Swaziland, but the entire African continent as we all tend to get taken away by western culture that then upset our way of doing things.

It is therefore imperative that we revisit our culture and how we used to do things before we adopted other cultures. The former colonial masters have now gone and it is upon us to then adjust our laws to suit our way of life. Materialism is causing all the war which is usually over estates.

Rift

It is a foreign element that is causing this entire rift within families," he added.

He went on to state that in Swazi tradition it is known what belongs to whom and there is never a need to approach the court of law to declare which wife is superior and what is rightfully theirs.

'Western marriage not superior to Swazi Law and Custom'

Sikhondze is not happy with the impression that Swazi Law and Custom marriages are inferior to the western ways of marriage, which he feels is now taken as the common truth in the country.

"Kwendza kuyalingana," Sikhondze said when stressing a point that whether one marries the Swazi way or through civil rites, both marriages are equal, at least in the traditional eyes of the Swazis.

He lamented what was currently happening in the country where a man after taking many wives and later succumbing to death one of the wives then takes the court route to nullify the other marriages despite that the deceased has lived many years with the other wives.

He viewed this as the decay of the Swazi way of doing things stating; "Loku sekufa kwemihambo yemaSwati."

This he said after a recent ruling by High Court Judge Mumcy Dlamini that the late former senator and public transport operator of Phakama Bus Service Richard Themba Dlamini only had one wife, in terms of the law.

Sarah Dlamini, the mother of prominent medical practitioner Dr Futhi Dlamini, PS tourism Emmunual Dlamini and NAM-BOARD Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Siphephiso Dlamini and others was declared the only official wife to the late senator.

She declared that Sarah and Richard married on August 5, 1960 in civil rites, ending a dispute between her and three other women, who were married by the late businessman through Swazi Law and Custom. The judge ordered that the Swazi Law and Custom marriage of Richard to Martha Makhanya, Jenneth Sihlongonyane and Cecelia Makhanya was bigamous, therefore declared them null and void

Sikhondze said he read the judgment with great awe as what he understands is that the late Richard took all the four women as his wives, built them homes and lived with all of them.

Bonkhe bekubafati bakhe, hhayi nje imitfukuso," bellowed Sikhondze.

He called upon the country's legislators to rightfully repeal the law that gives the impression that civil rites marriages are superior to Swazi Law and Customs marriages which allowed the Judge to reach the decision of nullifying the three other marriages.

Yes, Parly should stand up and be counted - MP Gundwane

He said it is important that

they enact proper laws that will end the endless rifts within families especially when it concerns estates.

Wives

He said what pains him the most is the fact that men take their wives and live with them for some time, only for just one wife to then decide the others' fate once their husband passes on.

"In some instances you find that the wives have spent all their energies giving their all to their families only to be told at a later stage that their marriages are null and void. Most often this is during a time when they can no longer do anything for themselves as they have spent all their productive lives living with their husbands. As parliament we need to make strict laws that will put an end to this," he said. He said as a parliamentarian and Swazi citizen he is very concerned about the turn of events in this case.

SUSPENDED PRINCIPAL MILKS GOVT E2 MILION

or about nine years now suspended principal at Franson Christian High school has been drawing a salary without his matter brought to finality by the school administration, nor the Teaching Service Commission (TSC.

According to calculations from the old government scale D5 which he is being paid under, he was drawing a salary of E239 819 per annum which effectively means that for the past nine years he has earned E2 158 371 while also making extra money as a lec-

Memory Ndwandwe, who was suspended for alleged maladministration, is now employed by one of the country's private institutions of higher learning AMADI University while also being paid by government.

His many years of earning a salary for doing nothing flies on the face of the TSC chairman, Simanga Mamba, who recently defended their position of lifting a suspension against St. Marks Primary School Principal Albert Fakudze for allegedly embezzling thousands of school funds, whom they later posted at New Mbuluzi.

Fakudze had been suspended for hardly a year and the TSC felt he should not remain at home since that was a drain to government coffers.

Ndwandwe is not the only principal drawing a salary whilst at

home, waiting for a day where his matter would be heard and finalised, there are many other principals like him, but the Fakudze case now appears to have been an exception to the rule.

All these years Ndwandwe has neither been hauled before a disciplinary tribunal or engaged in any form after being served with a letter of suspension by the school grantee at the mission school situated at Mhlosheni.

Investigations carried out by the Observer on Saturday revealed that the grantee suspended the principal after allegations of maladministration were levelled at him but since then there has not been any development on how far the matter has

This effectively means that Ndwandwe now receives two fat cheques at the end of the month as he draws his salary from government and at his new employer AMADI University where he is now a Lecturer. Government has all along been paying the principal since the matter he was not suspended by the Ministry of Education under the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) but his suspension was merely an administrative issue within the mission as the grantee suspended him.

Under normal circumstances, principals are suspended with half pay while their matters are being investigated before being hauled for disciplinary hearings.

Concerned parents at the school have questioned the school administration on why Ndwandwe's issue was not dealt with, since the school is now being headed by the deputy who has been holding the fort for the past years. It has been gathered that Ndwandwe will also benefit from the new salary review under Government Circular No 1 of 2016 since he is still deemed a civil servant.

It could however not be gathered as to how much he now earns at AMADI University, an institution he decided to join after lying idle at

Then sought for comment, suspended principal Memory Ndwandwe admitted that he has been drawing a monthly salary from government for the past nine years while nolonger doing any work.

Ndwandwe in an interview with the Observer on Saturday said he has been waiting in vain for the school grantee at Franson Christian High to inform him what next would follow pertaining his case.

Ndwandwe was suspended for alleged maladministration at the school sometime in 2007 after the school grantee in consultation with the board at the mission school decided he should go home while his matter was being dealt with.

"For the past nine years, I have been getting paid each month, but am worried that after the grantee suspended me, there has been no correspondence from

the school on the way forward, I have not been even taken for a disciplinary hearing," Ndwandwe said.

When asked what the ministry of education has been doing as regards the matter, he stated that they approached the school but nothing has been done by the grantee to date.

Efforts to get the school grantee for comment were unsuccessful as the telephone line was faulty each time the school was called at Mhlosheni.

However sources close to the matter confided with this reporter that the grantee has been the person dealing with the principal's issue.



Swazi Airways maiden flight hangs in the balance

n what may come as a shock to most that are anticipating the maiden flight of the already launched Swazi Airways, plans to have the airplane finally taking off before the end of this month are at the brink of collapse.

It was stated that the maiden flight would be this month, but looking at things this seems almost impossible with the current problems.

This is according to reports that the country is racing against time to raise a sum of E7 million before the end of this month, payable to the lessor of the aircraft in South Africa as a bank guarantee for the lease agreement.

According to impeccable sources, what has further compounded the delay in the preparations for the maiden flight is the fact that Royal Swazi National Airways Corporation (RSNAC) Board's term of office came to an end, thus placing a snag in the preparations.

Behind

With no authority to push the project, government has been running behind in all its commitments in this matter, including obtaining a license from the Swaziland Civil Aviation Authority (SWACAA) that is recognised by the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) that will in turn allow the airline to enter their territories.

Prime Minister Barnabas Sibusiso
Dlamini recently disclosed to the
Editors Forum that the process of
applying for an Air Operator's
Certificate (AOC) is ongoing while
admitting that it has already taken
longer than anticipated when the
announcement was made in February.

He explained that the exercise involves about 20 manuals and other technical documents, which have to be scrutinised thoroughly by SWACAA's technical personnel and approved.

He said Swazi Airways personnel have been making the necessary interventions to satisfy SWACAA's requirements.

"In simple terms an AOC is the approval granted by a Civil Aviation Authority like SWACAA to an air-



craft operator to allow it to use aircraft for commercial purposes. The AOC is recognised by all International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO) Member States which will not permit any airline to enter their territories without one," he said. While government has already spent over E20 million towards seeing the plans of the maiden flight through, but all that could go to waste if the preparations fail to materialise on time.

Conceded

Ministry of Public Works and Transport Principal Secretary Makhosini Mndawe, when reached on the matter conceded that the term of office for the RSNAC Board had come to an end, but highlighted that the term had since been extended by the minister in charge, soon after it elapsed. This is despite that when some members of the Board when reached could only state that they just recently received the letter alerting them of the extension and were worried that they currently have nothing that directs them to speedily work on the Swazi Airways issue.

"It is true that the RSNAC Board's term of office came to an end and there were a few days uncertainty. However, this was sorted out when the minister extended the term with effect from the day after the date of expiry. There is no longer a snag since the board is back in place," said the PS.

Mndawe went on to disclose that the minister will work with the Public Enterprise Unit (PEU) for the appointment of a new board over the next few months once the extended term expires. He allayed fears that the preparations for the maiden flight have not been abandoned.

"The board will continue working with UNICORPE, the consulting firm that was appointed for the revival of the airline," he assured.

the airline," he assured.

Hr also highlighted that the Swazi
Airways needs to have an aircraft in
place to facilitate the issuance of an
Air Operator's Certificate by SWACAA hence the company leased an
aircraft from a company in South
Africa.

Failure

"The said E7 million is a sum of money that the lessor wants for the bank to issue a guarantee in the event of Swazi Airways' failure to pay the lease. E16.4 million was spent in the 2015/16 financial year and E4.1 million was released during the first quarter of 2016/17. Another E4.1 million is being released to Swazi Airways for the second quarter of 2016/17," further explained Mndawe.

Meanwhile, the initial plans were such that the Swazi Airways maiden flight would be in February before the date was shifted to this month.

The long term plans of the flight is to service routes as far as Mumbai in India and the Seychelles as well as Zimbabwe and the Dubai in the United Arab Emirates.

COMESA wants KMIII Airport to be passenger hub

OMESA has come with good news to
Swaziland courtesy of a visit by the regional organization's Secretary General
Sindiso Ngwenya, who is currently in the country and paid a courtesy call to the Deputy Prime Minister Paul Dlamini yesterday.

COMESA is an acronym for Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa.

Ngwenya in his brief meeting with the DPM in Mbabane yesterday highlighted that the organisation wants to contribute in assisting the country in turning the KMIII International Airport into a passenger hub very soon.

He further disclosed that they also want to be involved in the plans to turn the Matsapha airport into a reputable civil aviation school in the region and in the continent.

Ensure

He said they are currently in consultation with the Ministry of Public Works and Transport to ensure that all the above plans come to fruition.

He assured the country that COMESA was fully behind the country, highlighting that their plans will soon come to fruition soon, which is the time they will start the celebrations.

Ngwenya also pointed out that he was recently in the country to celebrate the organisation's achievements with the country, while this week he was here to hand over a big project they are involved in at Shiselweni.

The project covers 32 hectares of drip irrigation that will produce 2 000 tonnes of vegetables. It will service 42 households with an annual income of E2.3 million. If this project can be replicated in all the country's four regions the country can prosper and be able to empower its people. We will try to work hard with government to ensure that the project is sustained," he said.

Ngwenya added that there are also plans to empower the Swaziland Royal Insurance Corporation (SRIC) to be able to provide credit insurance to a number of Swazis so that they easily assess notable loans with the country's monetary institutions. He said credit insurance should be up to at least E200 million.

Support

"We're all looking towards the country's vision 2022 and considering many ways we can support such a dream. We're also working on presenting a trade hub in the region," he added.

Meanwhile, the DPM on the other hand appreciated the efforts that are shown by COMESA in assisting development initiatives in the country. He said the project at Shiselweni would assist many people especially women who are the ones that work hard to put food on the table in many homesteads. He said women not only cook anymore, but also ensure that the food is available in their homes.

"Therefore, women need to be assisted by all means in ensuring that their plans are successful. We can only hope that the entire Shiselweni region will benefit from the pilot drip irrigation project," said the Deputy Premier.

First case of Zika spread by sex from woman to man

EW YORK - The first known case of a woman spreading the Zika virus to a man during unprotected sex was reported yesterday in New York City, health authorities said.

Until now, experts were aware only of cases in which men spread the virus to their partners during sex, as well as transmission by mosquito bites. The New York case involved a "nonpregnant woman in her twenties who reported she had engaged in a single event of condomless vaginal intercourse with a male partner the day she returned to New York City from travel to an area with ongoing Zika virus transmission," the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said. Its report did not specify where the woman may have been infected.

The next day, she developed fever, back pain, swelling and numbness and tingling in her hands and feet.

She tested positive for Zika, a typically mosquito-borne virus that is spreading rapidly through the Caribbean and Latin America.

Her male partner said he had not traveled outside the United States during the prior year.

He also said he did not have any other recent sexual partners and had not been bitten by mosquitoes in the week before his illness.

"The New York City report of female-to-male sexual transmission of Zika virus infection is the first documented case of sexual transmission of Zika from a woman to her sex partner and adds to the growing body of knowledge about the sexual trans-

mission of Zika," the CDC said, Zika can cause birth defects, including the brain and skull deformity known as microcephaly.

Health authorities are urging pregnant women to abstain from sex or use barrier methods of contraception during sex if their partners have traveled to or live in areas where the Zika virus is present.

"Although no cases of woman-towoman Zika transmission have been reported, these recommendations now also apply to female sex partners of pregnant women," the CDC said. The federal agency said it is updating its guidelines because the current advice to prevent sexual transmission of Zika "is based on the assumption that transmission occurs from a male partner to a receptive partner." AFP





n an averted strike that had been planned for today by disgruntled Montigny Investments employees, they will now be happy to learn that they will be refunded their money, which was taken as their pension contributions.

Over 3 000 employees will get their refunds from Monday. The money was deducted from their monthly salaries from June last

ESWATU President Mashumi is not happy with the involvement of Labour Brokers and contractors in the employment of workers as opposed to them being engaged by the principal employer from the onset.

Shongwe noted that it becomes impossible for Trade Unions to negotiate and bargain with the principal (employer) as there is the middleman that bars such negotiations. He screamed; "Akusebenteki," when driving the point that it is just impossible to work with the middleman being the conduit between the employer and employee. He said it is understood that the Labour Brokers and Contractors came into the picture as a result of a break in trust between the employer and employee in the past.

"The situation is such that the Labour Broker can just take everything from the office once they are not happy any more with the arrangement between the parties. It is impossible for trade unions to negotiate on behalf of the workers and when we can handle issues better we don't get that particular chance," he said.

Shongwe then highlighted that in the workplace it is not always about fighting, but about improving the working conditions and production so that all parties benefit from the union. He said for workers' benefits to improve there is a need for them to work harder for the company to be more productive.

"We therefore cannot as workers expect to get a 13th cheque from 'the employer' when there is no money that the company is making. It is important that workers understand this for better production in the country," he added.

year and there have been fears that operations at the company, based in Bhunya, could come to a standstill this morning as the workers threatened to down their tools yet again. This followed rumours that they would not get their pension money yesterday as promised by management. This was not the first time that operations were halted at the company as the workers also downed their tools last month, demanding answers on their pension contributions.

The visibly angry workers stated clearly that they did not want anything to do with the contribution because they were not informed about it in the first place.

However, Federation of Swaziland Trade

Unions (FESWATU) President Mashumi
Shongwe in an interview with Observer on
Saturday yesterday confirmed that an agreement had been reached between the employer and the workers pertaining to them being
refunded the money deducted from their
salaries.

He explained that the money was indeed deducted unlawfully as it was through a government gazette, the Pensions Fund Legal Notice of 2015, which did not comply with the provisions of the Wages Act of 1964.

He said the Act has clear guidelines, which were unfortunately not followed by the gazette.

"Section 18 of the Gazette directed that the

employer shall ensure that deductions of 5% on the employee's salary would be deducted, something which is irregular. The Pensions Fund Act of 2000 clearly directs how it should be done.

The money was deducted and remitted with Metropolitan, and it is not true that the money was not remitted as there are records to prove that," Shongwe said.

Shongwe further stated the employees would start getting their money as from Monday and highlighted that it is not because of the strike action that the consensus has been reached between the employer and employee.

He said it has been proper negotiations that have yielded the fruits.

He also highlighted that it is not only
Montigny workers that are under this



UN, TRUCK ATTACK M N DOZENS IN N

has killed 84 people and seriously injured dozens more after he used a 25-tonne lorry to go on a mile-long killing spree by mounting pavements at high speed. and ploughing through crowds celebrating Bastille Day in Nice on Thursday night.

The killer, a 31-year-old French-Tunisian Mohamed Lahouaiej Bouhlel who was known to police, then got out and sprayed fleeing revellers with bullets before being shot dead by police after his 30 minute rampage, which has left 54 children injured alone.

One eyewitness described seeing 'bodies flying like bowling pins' and others 'jammed' under the lorry's wheels as the horror unfolded at around 10.30pm local time last

Heartbroken men and women refused to leave the bodies of their loved ones and the dead remain strewn across the famous Promenade de Anglais yesterday.

Some of the victims were children, with young girls and boys lying dead covered in blankets with their dolls and buggies still next to them. Footage taken at the time of the attack shows bodies piled up in the roads and people running for their lives as they tried to avoid the zigzagging lorry while paramedics treated the injured and dying in the street.

Mission

The truck driver was said to have shouted 'Allahu Akbar' - God is great in Arabic - before being killed in a clear suicide mission. Pro-ISIS groups have been celebrating the attack, orchestrated to coincide with France's most important national

A huge cache of guns, grenades and 'larger weapons' and the terrorist's identity papers were later found inside the lorry, which mounted the pavement at approximately 40mph and steered directly towards hunworks display.

Coincide dreds of people watching a fire-

ISIS supporters have been cele-brating the attack, orchestrated to coincide with France's most important national holiday.

The gunman is believed to be from Nice and was known to police for crimes of theft and violence, but not intelligence services, a police source said. A suspected accomplice is on the run.

French President Francois Hollande yesterday pledged to 'hit' ISIS in Syria and Iraq 'even harder' after the devastating attack, saying: "France is in tears, it is hurting but it is strong and she will be stronger always stronger than the fanatics who wish to hurt us."

Yesterday the delivery truck, riddled with bullets, remains in the centre of Nice with bodies strewn nearby.

Damien Allemand, a journalist for French regional newspaper Nice Matin saw the horror unfold.

He said the attack began just as the fireworks display ended as thousands of people were milling around the waterside.

He said: "He rode up onto the Prom and piled into the crowd. A fraction of a second later, an enormous white truck came along at a crazy speed, turning the wheel to mow down the maximum number of people. I saw bodies flying like bowling pins along its route. Heard noises, cries that I will never forget."

Gunshots

Witnesses of the attack in Nice described seeing people run through the streets as they heard gunshots. Wassim Bouhel told the French TV channel iTele that the lorry zigzagged across the road.

He said: 'We almost died. It was like hallucinating ... (the lorry) zigzagged - you had no idea where it was going. My wife was a metre away. 'The lorry ripped through everything, poles, and trees. We

have never seen anything like it. Some people were hanging on the door and tried to stop it.

Around 100 people were forced to dive into the sea as panic ensued and holiday crowds desperately ran for their lives. The gunman then jumped out of the truck and opened fire, which is when he was shot dead by police.

French President Francois Hollande said several children were among the dead and added that it was 'undeniable' the massacre was a terrorist attack.

Lockdown

Anti-terror police swooped in as the city was put on lockdown and residents were warned to stay indoors for their safety. Gunshots rang out in the streets, with the gunman targeting hotels and cafes in the port city in the south of France.

One witness called Antoine said: We were at the Neptune beach and a firework display had just finished. That is when we saw a white lorry. It was going quickly at 60-70 kilometres an hour."

Eyewitness Wassim Bouhlel said that he saw a truck drive into the crowd and then witnessed the man emerge with a gun and started shooting. Dailymail

French Pres pledges to hit ISIS in Syria, Iraq Harder

*ICE - French President François Hollande said it was undeniable that last night's attack was a terrorist atroci-

In an emotional speech, President Hollande said: "Last night a lorry hit a crowd of people in Nice with the intention of killing.

"At the time I speak there are 77 victims, of which many are children.

"Once again we have seen extreme violence and it is obvious we must do everything to fight against this terrorism.

The driver was shot and killed. We are investigating whether he was linked to any others.

"France has been hit on national day, the 14th of July.

"I want to express my solidarity with the nation, which is now in mourning. I have instructed all regional hospitals to be prepared for an influx of injured.

"Under these circumstances we must display caution, and we must work together but we must during this busy weekend show care and attention for security.

"I will once again mention our highest military operation of secu-

of 10 000 military officers across the country.

Brigades

"This will cover all brigades of the police, who will be called from across the country, to the Nice region to assist their comrades

"We will also pay much attention to tightening borders and I will now announce that the state of emergency which was meant to be lifted will be extended a further three months.

"Following this we will show real force and military action in Iraq and Syria. Our defence department will hold a meeting later this morning. Following this meeting I will travel with the prime minsiter to Nice later today.

France has been hit by tragedy once again.

This monstrosity of using a lorry to deliberately kill people, many people, who only came out to celebrate their national day."

THIS IS WAR - DONALD TRUMP

ASHINGTON DC -Donald Trump said if elected president, he would declare war on the Islamic State - hours after quickly seizing on horrific reports of another deadly attack in France to ask his Twitter followers: "When will we learn?"

Trump was responding to reports that 80 people had been killed and more than 100 injured when a truck carrying weapons and hand grenades plowed into people celebrating Bastille Day in Nice on Thursday evening.

Although it was not immediately clear who was behind the attack, Trump said in an interview with Fox News Channel's The O'Reilly Factor, Trump said: 'This is war.'

Attack

He said if he's elected president, he would ask Congress for a declaration of war on ISIS - as unconfirmed reports claimed the terror group had claimed responsibility for the attack, 05

The 70-year-old said that to fight the terror group, which he called a 'cancer,' NATO should be used 'for a purpose.'

In another interview, Trump called for President Obama to acknowledge the problem was 'radical Islam.'

He also reiterated his call for the United States to tighten its borders and brought up his proposal to ban Muslims from entering the country as a solution.

As news broke of the attack, the billionaire real estate mogul tweeted: "Another horrific attack, this time in Nice, France. Many dead and injured. When will we learn? It is only getting worse".

Radical

In an interview with Fox N Great van Susteren later on Thursday night, Trump said 'it's about time' Obama used the term 'radical Islam.'

Although not much is known yet about the attacks in Nice. Tump said: "Generally speaking, I don't think the people come out of Sweden, OK?

"It's probably, possibly, but if it is indeed radical Islamic terrorism, it's about time that [Obama] would say so, OK?"

FREEZING OF EX-SWAZI MTN EMPLOYEE'S PENSION REVERSED

The former Swazi MTN employee accused of defrauding the company E480 000 will now receive his pension that had been frozen by Nedbank Swaziland.

The bank had frozen Wandile Nxumalo's pension following a court order won by Swazi MTN in a bid to recover its monies in case Nxumalo is found to have indeed defrauded the monies. Nxumalo challenged the order before the High Court and High Court Principal Judge Stanley Maphalala dismissed the mobile network operator's interim court order. This was after Swazi MTN did not show up before court.

Nxumalo was represented by Nhlabatsi Attorneys in the matter while Musa M Sibandze Attorneys appeared on behalf of Swazi MTN in the matter.

The mobile network operator filed an application to stay the execution of the order that effectively gave Nxumalo access to his bank account on the grounds that the order was granted after Nxumalo's lawyer had employed tricks.

When the stay of execution of the order was argued, Nhlabatsi point-



ed out that the court no longer had powers to re-open the matter and deal with it because it had already issued an order cancelling the one that froze Nxumalo's bank accounts which had his pension payout from Tibiyo Insurance Brokers.

Argued

He further argued that the order dismissing Swazi MTN's application had been granted properly and the only remedy available to Swazi MTN was to apply for rescission order.

The judge said the court had dealt with the matter to finality and had no further business in the conduct of the case.

"In the instant case, the applicant (Swazi MTN) can only apply for a rescission of the order advancing proper grounds for such application. In the exercise of my discretion on costs, I rule that costs be in the ordinary scale," he said.

He dismissed Swazi MTIv's application to stall reopening of Nxumalo's bank account.

Nxumalo is charged with defrauding the company of the money by secretly and unlawfully selling airtime at discounted rates using two cell phone numbers. It was alleged that he had been employed as a billing administrator under the sales and distribution department.

Resigned

He resigned on March 27, 2016; about a week after the company had instituted investigations on airtime resellers who were allegedly selling airtime at discounted rates fraudulently.

It was alleged that two cell phone numbers were allegedly being used to fraudulently refill and sell airtime and one of them belonged to Nxumalo. The company claimed that after Nxumalo's resignation, he was paid his pension and it was deposited into his bank account. The company applied for an interim order to freeze the bank account so that it could use the pension as security in case it won its claim against him.

The civil claim is still pending before the High Court.

Businessman allegedly pocketed E17 000 in Hhelehhele robbery

onteyn businessman Douglas Stanford is alleged to have pocketed-E17 00 from the daring armed robbery at Hhelehhele candle making factory where over E640 000 worth of property was stolen at gun

Over E320 000 in cash and property such as cars, firearms, ammunition and valuable gadgets were taken by the suspected robbers on April 8, 2016. Stanford has applied to be admitted to bail but investigating officer detective Constable V Mngometulu had opposed it. In his application Stanford has said he is innocent of the charges preferred against him because he was merely a passenger in the motor vehicle that was hurled with bullets by police where one of the suspects named Vusi was in.

He claimed that he were linked to the crimes just because the said Vusi was using his cellphone when communicating with the other suspects who were part of the syndicate that committed the

But the investigating officer has a different version. Mngometulu, in an affidavit filed by the Director of Public Prosecutions Nkosinathi Maseko's office, says Stanford has a history of violence. He claimed that he has a pending case of armed robbery committed at Madonsa in 2013 and a firearm was also used and was out on bail when he was arrested for the Hhelehhele robbery. He says releasing him would undermine the bail system because he might commit another simi-

"I submit that the applicant (Stanford) participated in the planning of the current offence. He was present on the first attempt to commit the offence at around 7 pm on April 7, 2016. However, they were disturbed by dogs. I submit that he slept with his coaccused at Ngculwini at a Shongwe robbery operation. I submit that he did not then attend the robbery on the morning of April 8, 2016 and remained

at Ngculwini on the pretext that he ha fallen sick," Mngometulu said. He claimed that after the robbery had been committed, the other suspects returned at Ngculwini and divided the spoils where Stanford was given E17 000. The officer claimed that the money was recovered by the police from Stanford's wife in their rented flat. Robbery

He claimed that the robbery was wrongly executed by the suspects as some of them were arrested on the scene and then alerted their buddies. He claimed that Stanford and the said Vusi were part of the robbery operation and the only ones from Mbabane. He claimed that the two were not aware that their friends had been arrested. Therefore, they drove to Manzini to collect Vusi's cellphone which had remained with one of the accomplices at Hhelehhele. He also claimed that there was also accomplice evidence linking him to the offence, therefore he stood to be punished like the others and face above eight years in prison if convicted. The matter was before High Court Judge Stanley Maphalala who postponed it to hear arguments between the parties. Stanford is represented by Mabuza Attorneys in the matter.







He urged legal practitioners to ensure that their maintained a good integrity.


He further urged the new lawyers to join the Law Society of Swaziland (LSS) and pay subscriptions.

SECURITY GUARDS DOWN BATONS AT GUARD ALERT

Security guards employed by one of the country's leading security entity, Guard Alert, yesterday literally downed their batons in Mbabane as they wanted the company to address a list of grievances they have.

Amongst the grievances is the review of their salary, which they feel is long overdue since they can no longer cope with the high inflation rate.

The security guards invaded the company offices just after 8am yesterday demanding to see management, which they accused of playing hide and seek since they tabled their grievances some time back, but to date they have not been addressed.

Chanting slogans normally used during an industrial action by workers, the security guards, who were represented by the Swaziland Amalgamated Trade Union (SATU), kept toyi toying outside the offices while the union was engaged in talks with management.

According to SATU Secretary General Frank Mncina, all the guards want is for management to address their concerns, which they raised a long time ago.

Mncina, who was locked in a meeting with the company's Human Resources Officer (HR) Mbuso Dube, blamed management for letting the situation reach a boiling point since yesterday's action could have been averted, had the concerns been addressed.

"Why have you as management let the situation to reach this point, you are an HR officer you know the law why don't you advise your bosses on these issues since they touch in the Industrial Relations Act," Mncina asked a visibly confused Dube.

During the meeting with management, Mncina advised the HR to call

- They invade company offices with list of grievances including a call for salary review amongst others
- Want company to address their poor working conditions, citing no guard houses, questionable deduction of their salaries

his bosses, which Dube did in front of Hhohho Police Regional Commissioner Charles Tsabedze, as the toyi toying guards would hear none of Dube's word.

Address

However, upon ending the call, Dube told the union representatives that he was speaking to the Director Christopher Scottlong's son, who informed him that his father is indisposed and could not make it to the offices to address the workers.

It was then that Mncina advised

Dube that this was in fact a complex situation as the guards would not understand any of the explanation since all they wanted was word that their concerns are addressed.

The union, Tsabedze and the management later resolved that Dube should be the one addressing the guards and relay the message of the Director's position, this Mncina said after stating that the guards at times hold the view that they are being bribed by the company hence their grievances not addressed.

Management held hostage, cars blocked from leaving offices

Drama unfolded when the toyi toying security guards held management hostage as they prevented cars from leaving the company premises.

At one point the main door to the company offices had to be locked as the guards tried to force their way into the HR office demanding that he comes out with the company directors to address their concerns.

The directors were, however, not in office when the incident happened and the presence of the police came in handy as they calmed down the situation bringing the guards to order. They told them not to go anywhere near the offices, but remain at the company yard.

An additional 15 police officers were deployed at the scene to bring law and order as they prevented damage of property.

One of the mangers tried to drive off in the company car, but had to call off his journey as the car was blocked and prevented from leaving the premises.

Upon seeing he could not move an inch the manger killed the engine, alighted from the vehicle and went back to the meeting with the

- They have their salaries deducted when one has a case to answer

union members and the HR officer.

The toyi toyi lasted for more than two hours before Mncina and the union, the Regional Commissioner and Dube came out to address the guards.

At first the guards would hear none of Dube's word as they shouted to the effect that he was always dishonest as regards the matter.

However, after the union leaders from SATU reasoned with the guards, they eventually gave Dube an ear and this is when Dube informed them that the director is indisposed but their concerns would be addressed.

The guards have vowed to continue with their demonstrations which will be held in Manzini and Matsapha until their grievances are addressed.

Asian nationals now occupy irregular business spaces

Thile Members of Parliament successfully voted for the intensive investigations into the influx of Asian nationals into the country, it has been gathered that some of them posing as investors, actually occupy irregular business spaces within the country's cities and towns.

In fact the Observer on Saturday has unearthed that some have gone to the extent of using the business outlets, which in most cases are for groceries, as their sources of accommodation since they sleep under the same roof consumables are kept in.

The Kingdom's hub (Manzini), which has become densely populated with Asian nationals, mostly of Pakistani origin, has some of them using the little space they can lay their hands on to run their cellphone businesses. Stairways in some of the buildings within the city have been turned into business outlets since these are now converted into small office spaces where the businesses are operated.

According to some residents from Manzini, who have been following parliament's concern closely, they held the view that the motion moved by Lobamba Lomdzala Member of Parliament (MP) Marwick Khumalo was long overdue.

They felt that most towns, especially Manzini, have now been turned into foreign towns owing to the fact that during the Ramadan period and

on Fridays, the city shuts down as the majority of the business outlets including car dealing ones, which are operated by the Asian nationals. "We have been observing the continued influx of Asian nationals especially those of Pakistani and Indian origin into Swaziland and wondered what is being done, since these people appear in court almost on a daily basis for being in the country illegally. Selling and fixing cellphones is not an investment," said an airtime vendor Samkeliso Sithole.

Another vendor shared the same sentiments as he was of the view that parliament was right when stating that economically the country does not benefit since most of these nationals do not even do banking with the local banks.

"This is a very serious issue touching on how

some of these people get to be holders of almost all Swazi documents yet some Swazis even struggle to obtain the same. Get me clearly here, I am not against these people, but I am worried about their continued influx into the country. Our children now fight for spaces in some schools with them," said Manqoba Khumalo, who operates a hair dressing business within the city.

An inspection carried out by a team from this publication this week revealed that indeed some of the Pakistani nationals spend the nights in their shopping outlets within the country's cities and towns.

Same roof

Shockingly, some who own restaurants sleep under the same roof where food meant to be served to members of the public is prepared. The Ministry of Home Affairs has already stopped the issuance of Khonta Certificates for foreign nationals in the country after, revelations to the effect that such were being abused and the rot has been unearthed.

The Lobamba Lomdzala MP Khumalo successfully moved a motion calling for the election of a powerful 10 member committee to look into the loopholes of the country's immigration system causing the influx of illegal immigrants, the majority being those of Asian origin.

MP Khumalo instructed Minister Tsandzile to ensure that not even a single illegal immigrant enters the country. Most Pakistani, Indian nationals use stairways as business domicile

 Others use rented restaurants, grocery outlets as bedrooms in both rural, urban areas

Part of the elected committee's mandate would be to look into the residential status of the illegal immigrants, investigate issuance of memos or entry permits within the department of immigration at the ministry that accord free entry to these immigrants.

It has been gathered that most of these people are trafficked into the country by their fellow countrymen who kept them as slaves to work in their shops and factories in return for meals.

MP Khumalo said government was equally concerned if these people were being trafficked and that money collected from Swazis is kept in trunk boxes creating confusion as to whether they are criminals or genuine investors.

He said those who came to the country for genuine reasons should not suffer at the hands of these Asians.

He wondered what kind of investors were these people who come into the country and operate grocery shops and fish and chips, outlets? And to making matters worse what about the fact that these people do not even bank the money collected from Swazis at the local banks with some ending up in neighboring countries such as South Africa and Mozambique; an indication that they make Swaziland a conduit.

Minister Princess Tsandzile welcomed the motion observing that, should such a matter not be addressed, the whole country would have been occupied by these foreign nationals in the next 20 years, yet they are here to rip-off the country of the little it has.

CLOSING SHOPS DURING LUNCH ON FRIDAYS SHOULD STOP - PUBLIC

oncerned members of the public have called for the Ministry of Commerce Industry and Trade to look into the issue of businesses run by Asian nationals, who close for two hours on Fridays.

With most parts of the country's towns and cities invaded by the Asian nationals mostly of Indian and Pakistani origin, members of the public feel that the towns come to a standstill between the hours of 12 noon and 2pm on Fridays while owners of the outlets go to church due to their religious beliefs.

The Home affairs Ministry had made mention

that such an issue will be looked upon by the relevant ministry, that of Commerce, calling for such to actually come to an end. Ministry of Commerce's Magenius Hlophe, when contacted for comment said he is not in a position to comment as regards the matter for now since it is now political. "I cannot comment on the matter now, the person who can be in a position to do so is the Minister," Hlophe said briefly.

However, when sought for comment, Minister for Commerce Gideon Dlamini could not be reached on his mobile phone, at least by the time this report was compiled.

Only 3 hoteliers interested in running Pigg's Peak Hotel

In a latest development, three companies are now interested in running the Pigg's Peak Hotel and Casino, which is located 10km away from the Northern Hhohho Region's main town of Pigg's Peak.

The Observer on Saturday has learnt that initial negotiations with one investor from the neighbouring South Africa later fell through after it turned out that the new investors would have to run both the hotel and casino. This happened after the company that was running the casino pulled out from the deal forcing government to then lease out the hotel and casino as a package, something the South African company had no interest in.

Pigg's Peak Hotel General Manager Zachariah Dlamini yesterday confirmed that they could not reach finality on the negotiations with the initial investor.

He said for now they have to start the negotiations afresh as the hotel is now a package with the casino.

"For now we cannot separate the hotel from the casino as there would be conflicting inter-

ests between the company running the hotel and the one running the casino. What usually happens is that if the casino has a certain number of gamblers they want to bring in, they also have to complement this with accommodation, but with a different owner of the hotel such proves difficult because they usually have different interests. The three remaining companies are interested in running both the hotel and casino. The one that pulled was not interested in running both, but only the hotel part of the package," he explained.

Meanwhile, Dlamini further confirmed that the E7 million renovations that have been ongoing in the hotel are almost complete. He said they had finished working on the previously leaking roof and glasses and all that was left was to do work on the interior. This is the second phase of the project.



Hungry families sandwiched by green sugarcane fields


ome families are still left behind as they are forced to only marvel at the riches some of their fellow society members have accrued from the fast growing sugarcane industry mainly in the Lubombo region.

Sandwiched between the sugarcane rich areas of KaNgcamphalala and Siphofaneni in this region, some homesteads glaringly look worse off and only depend on the handouts from the World Food Programme (WFP). It has already been reported in local daily newspapers that emergency relief distributions have begun in the country in response to drought, which has resulted in hundreds of thousands of people not having enough to eat. The recent El Nino induced drought that swept across the country left most families with no yields from their fields where they grow maize.

Turned

Indeed on the way to St. Phillip's it is clear that the maize fields are very dry and that the farmers in this part of the country have had nothing to show for the ploughing season. Driving along this part of the country one is met with two almost dry rivers that have turned into mere streams with streams having become dry. What these two rivers, Mhlathuze and Mhlathuzana, can now only show is just thin trickles of water running along their sandy courses. In places, people had dug holes in the river bed to collect ome water for themselves or perhaps for their cattle.

Further moving around the area, the sight of women pushing wheel barrows carrying containers of water and children carrying more containers on their heads is what is common. They are all forced to go and draw the water from the riversturned-streams, which they share with their livestock. It is the recent minimal rains that have improved the otherwise unyielding situation, giving hope to the community that more water is forthcoming.

The bottom line is that people are very hungry and have nothing to eat in this part of the country. What compounds the disadvantaged families' situation is the very green surroundings, which are made up of sugarcane fields that are supported by the Lower Usuthu Irrigation Project (LUSIP I) under the Swaziland Water & Agricultural Development Enterprise (SWADE), which has provided irrigation through the Lubovane Dam for the projects under them.

Disputes

"What you see is just what you get here. The situation is bad for some of us either because some of our sugarcane schemes have not kickstarted because of certain disputes amongst the various chiefs in the area pertaining land where we are supposed to grow the sugarcane. We cannot fend for ourselves because we could not get any yields from our maize fields hence we have to rely on WFP to give us food. We have for a long time been left with no water to be able to grow maize and vegetables hence our inconsolable situation," said one resident.

The WFP was first to assess the situation in all parts of the country that have been affected by the drought including the Lubombo and Shiselweni regions. Their assessment showed that in the country

alone, some 350 000 people are in need of urgent food assistance and that is nearly a third of the population.

Discoveries

They also made a number of shocking discoveries during their assessment, which WFP's Communications Officer for Southern Africa David Orr compiled in his report carried on the organisation's website.

"We worked in our fields but didn't harvest anything", Vuyisile Shabangu (40), who resides on the way to Sithobela, told Orr.

"The situation is really very bad; we don't know what we're going to

eat from one day to the next." Distribution

In his report he further described the situation on the ground stating that on a piece of open ground near the road, a few hundred people had gathered for a distribution of rations — maize, yellow peas and vegetable oil - from the World Food Programme.

The supplies were being handed out by WFP partners, Save the Children, then measured out and divided up according to household size. Most of those who had gathered there were women, who went about their tasks with efficiency and good humour.

WFP has launched its relief operation in response to the worst food security crisis in the region in more than two decades. It has been caused by two consecutive years of drought, most recently as a result of the El Niño phenomenon which meant reduced rains during the ploughing season.

Swaziland is one of five countries in the region that has declared a state of disaster and appealed for international assistance. Because the drought is so widespread, casual work in neighbouring South Africa has also dried up and incomes have fallen. Also causing hardship is a rise in prices as maize now costs more than twice what it did a year ago in the Kingdom.

Hungry

"It's been very difficult", explains Vuyisile. "Since I was born, this is the worst drought I've ever experienced. As parents, we often go to bed hungry so our children can eat. Sometimes if they have some food, the neighbours will give us something to eat."

For now at least, the people who have gathered here will have some food for themselves and their families.

But the harsh fact is that the lean season has come early this year and it will be a long time till the next harvest in April next year.

To meet the growing needs, WFP is working to scale up its relief operations in support of the government. It will only be able to do so, however, if the necessary funding is secured. David Orr, a former newspaper foreign correspondent, has been working for WFP since 2010. He is based in Johannesburg as the organisation's communications officer for the region.

WFP needs E143m for drought relief in SD

nited Nations (UN) food agency, the World Food Programme (WFP) needs over US\$730 million (about E10.95 billion) over the next 12 months for relief in seven Southern African countries including Swaziland that are hit hard by the El Nino induced

The organisation actually faces a US\$610 million (about E8.8 billion) shortfall for the Southern Africa drought relief. WFP said in a statement said the seven countries were Malawi, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Lesotho, Madagascar, Swaziland and Zambia.


WFP has already started distributions of food assistance in Swaziland in response to rising hunger due to the worst drought in the region in more than two decades. Some 350 000 people nearly a third of the population of Swaziland - are in urgent need of food assistance, according to the Swaziland Vulnerability and Assessment Committee.

"Many rural communities are in the grip of hunger and this is set to continue until at least the harvest next April," said Alberto Mendes, WFP country director in Swaziland.

"We're working with the Government and donors to mobilise assistance, but without more funding we will not be able to continue to assist those most in need."

The first cycle of distributions by WFP and non-government partners has targeted 78 000 people in the worst-affected areas of the country in support of the National Disaster

Management Agency.

WFP plans to reach 100 000 people in August and to scale up again to reach some 150 000 people by the height of the lean season in early 2017 through a combination of food and cash assistance. Government has also committed substantial resources to assist those in need.

Government, through Prime Minister Barnabas Sibusiso Dlamini declared a state of emergency in February and launched its National Emergency Response, Mitigation and Adaptation Plan

requiring almost US\$85 million (about E1 215 500 000), of which some US\$61 million (about E87 230 000 million has yet to be secured.

"The Government is aware of the need created by the drought and appreciates the support by partners like WFP whose efforts complement those of the Government, especially in providing food assistance to those who need it the most. The Government has committed about US\$10 million for food relief," said Russell Dlamini, the chief executive officer of the

National Disaster Management Agency. The United Nations has contributed US\$2.8 million (about E4 004 000) to food relief through its Central Emergency Response Fund. However, WFP still requires more than US\$10 million (about E143 million) to scale up its operations to meet needs of the most vulnerable through the lean season into next year. Swaziland is among the countries in the region hardest hit by two years of successive drought, most recently as a result of the El Niño weather event in Southern

During the last agricultural season, many farmers in Swaziland planted not just once but twice, only to see their crops wither and die in the ground. Parents at WFP food distributions have reported going hungry themselves in order to feed their children.

Water sources have declined by more than 50% in Swaziland due to the lack of rain. Contributing to the hardship faced by many has been a hike in food costs - maixe prices have more than doubled since last

In addition to supporting the National Disaster Management Agency, WFP is working with nongovernment organisations including World Vision International, Save the Children Fund, Caritas and Africa Co-operative Action Trust Lilima (Swaziland).

Meanwhile, in Malawi, WFP has said it needed US\$288 million, but had only sourced US\$43 million, while in Zimbabwe - where drought has exacerbated an economic meltdown, which has led to unrest -US\$228 million was required, but only a tenth of that has been raised.

WFP is the world's largest humanitarian agency fighting hunger worldwide, delivering food assistance in emergencies and working with communities to improve nutrition and build resilience. Each year, WFP assists some 80 million people in around 80 countries.

An El Nino weather pattern, which ended in May, triggered drought conditions across the region, which hit the staple maize and other crops and dented economic growth.

SADC, EU, KENYA SUPPORTED WINNIE IN GENEVA CONFERENCE

abour and Social Security Minister Winnie Magagula had a number of countries in Geneva appreciating the progress the country had made in meeting the concerns raised in last year's confer-

The Government member of Botswana, speaking on behalf of the member States of the Southern African Development Community (SADC), stated that the Government briefed the member States and social partners of the SADC at their tripartite meetings on May 12 and June 1 2016 on progress made with regard to the implementation of the Convention.

He noted with satisfaction the significant progress made by the Government in addressing the issues to comply with the Convention, and noted in particular, the tabling in Parliament of amendments that had been brought to the legislation.

Numerous achievements were made in order to create a conducive

environment for effective social dialogue, which was evidenced by the fact that tripartite social dialogue structures were operational.

He also noted that the problems related to the registration of federations of trade unions had been resolved and ATUSWA, as well as FESWATU, had been registered.

Recalling that there were outstanding issues that needed to be addressed, in particular the need for Parliament to pass various bills in an expeditious way, he expressed confidence in the Government's commitment to address those rapidly.

He stated that the SADC encouraged the sharing of lessons and experiences by member States, and regularly reviewed and monitored the implementation of regional instruments such as the SADC Protocol on Employment and Labour, 2014, and the SADC Decent Work Programme 2013–19. which prioritised compliance with international labour standards.

He therefore encouraged and supported the efforts of the Government and social partners to address the outstanding issues to ensure full compliance with the Convention, and urged all stakeholders in Swaziland to work together in this regard. Finally, he commended the ILO for its technical support to the Government and social partners to address these issues.

EU also supported Government's progress

The Government member of the Netherlands, speaking on behalf of member States of the European Union, indicated that Albania, Iceland, Norway, the member States of the European Economic Area, as well as the Republic of Moldova and Georgia aligned themselves to this statement. He emphasised that the promo-

tion of the universal ratification and implementation of core labour standards, including this Convention, was part of the European Union Action Plan on Human Rights adopted in 2015, including the protection of human rights defenders including social partners. He recalled the commitment that had been made by the Government under the Cotonou

Agreement - the framework for Swaziland's cooperation with the European Union - to respect democracy, the rule of law and human rights principles, which included freedom of association. The European Parliament Resolution of May 21 2015 (2015/2712(RSP)) had called on the Government to take concrete measures to respect and promote human rights in the country. In that respect, he emphasised that they had engaged in a constructive dialogue with the Government

and non-state actors and were monitoring the progress achieved.

Noting that this case had been discussed a number of times at the Committee, he was pleased to acknowledge a number of positive steps taken by the Government since June 2015. He welcomed the unconditional release, soon after the Committee's discussion, of Thulani Maseko, and welcomed the registration of FESWATU in June 2015 and, recently, of ATUSWA.

Encouraged

He also acknowledged progress on legislative and administrative matters with ILO assistance, and strongly encouraged the Government to complete its legislative reform, including the amendment of the Suppression of Terrorism Act in consultation with social partners, in order to bring its legislation into compliance with international standards.

He expressed hope that all outstanding issues would be addressed promptly, so as to ensure full compliance with the Convention. He reiterated his readiness to cooperate with the Government and the people of Swaziland to promote development, including the full enjoyment of all human rights in the country.

Zimbabwe workers side with TUCOSWA

The Worker member of Zimbabwe, speaking on behalf of the Southern African Trade Union Co-ordination Council (SATUCC), recalled that in 2015 the Committee had requested that its recommendations be implemented in full consultation and collaboration with the social partners.

In spite of this, the Government had in fact continued to undermine TUCOSWA in its attempts to exercise its trade union rights.

Social dialogue, moreover, continued to be conducted in an environment that in all respects remained hostile to trade unions.

Such hostility was evident by statements made by the police, to the effect that trade unions were monsters that needed to be crushed, and the fact that the trade unionists, Mario Masuku and Maxwell Dlamini, had been arrested and subjected to grossly unfair conditions of

Zimbabwe employers support SD's progress

he Employer member of Zimbabwe supported the state-ment made by the Employer spokesperson regarding the exhaustive examples of advancements demonstrated by Swaziland.

He congratulated the Government on the progress made and acknowledged the need for additional efforts.

The report submitted by the Government confirmed that the ILO missions were not being wane in terms of willingness of the counterparts to com-

He stated that the delayed and difficult process TUCOSWA had experienced in getting itself registered attested to the Government's lack of true commitment to social dialogue. Indeed, social dialogue at the national level was not consciously and genuinely cultivated.

He concluded by stressing the importance of ensuring social diaply with the ratified ILO standards. The Government should be encouraged further to pass the pending Bills without further delay.

The registration of trade unions should be based on the standardised procedures, in line with the Convention.

In case the requirements were not to be met, the registration should not be possible. The Government should fully utilise social dialogue, and address to the ILO forum as the last resort.

logue not only at the national level, but at all levels, including within enterprises. The national situation, in which employers and the Government created and promoted sweetheart unions, was detrimental to the growth of genuine, representative unions, and thus detrimental to the realissation of genuine social dialogue.

South African Government welcomes progress

he Government member of South Africa fully endorsed the statement made on behalf of the SADC by the Government member of Botswana and highlighted the positive spirit of the social partners in the region, the SADC Private Sector Forum, and the enthusiasm and role played by the SATUCC and ITUC, which remained critical in the positive developments and notable progress in Swaziland.

Acknowledging the challenges the country had faced with regard to compliance with the Convention, the speaker observed that in 2015, the authorities had faced their situation with renewed

vigour and commitment, as evidenced by the amendment of the Industrial Relations Act to facilitate the registration of employers' and workers' federations.

These registrations had led to the reconstitution of all tripartite social dialogue structures and had given a voice to the social partners.

The speaker thanked ILO for the technical assistance it had provided to Swaziland with

regard to the legislative reform process, and in particular its support in the amendment of the Public Order Act. The assessment of the compliance of the amendments with the international labour standards was a crucial step in ensuring that the said amendments effectively addressed the shortfalls and gaps in the legislation.

Following a recommendation of the ILO, ITUC and SATUCC during a February 2016

mission, the authori-

ties had also submitted the Suppression of Terrorism Act to the social dialogue structures for review and discussion. In the framework of the SADC.

ne speaker supported

and encouraged Swaziland to continue its collaborative efforts. This tripartite position was a testimony of the new spirit of cooperation in Swaziland in pursuit of decent work and respect for fundamental principles and rights at work. The Committee was urged to provide assistance to the country by letting it complete the legislative reform work it had begun without the onerous burden of being included in the special paragraph.

US workers not impressed, urge government to make amendments

he Worker member of the United States deplored the lack of progress in the present

In keeping with its strategy of years past, the Government had once again taken only measures of a superficial nature, by proposing amendments to the laws with no intention of passing the said amendments, much less implementing them.

These proposed amendments, furthermore, were still not in conformity with the Convention. Also of particular concern was the failure of the proposed amendments to comply with the requirements of the AGOA specifically the eligibility benchmarks contained therein which required full guarantees of the exercise of freedom of association.

This failure to enact the necessary legislation resulted in the continued denial, to Swaziland, of preferential access to the US market under the AGOA, to the detriment of the nation and particularly the nation's workers. Clarify

With regards to section 2 of the Suppression of Terrorism Act, she stated that while the Government's proposal to include the words "by violent means" was a welcome one, further amendments were necessary to clarify the definition of terrorism; definitions of "lawful activities" and "lawful organisations" were also needed.

She also noted with concern that the overly broad definition of a terrorist group could serve as a means of suppressing trade union activity. She

underscored that dangerous ambiguities also existed in the Government's proposed amendments to the Public

The ground on which meetings and gatherings could be prohibited w vague and overly broad, which was tantamount to giving the authorities virtually complete discretion to quash any union gathering.

The penalties for violations of the Act, including even minor offences were overly harsh.

For instance, failure to provide seven days' notice for a public meeting was punishable by a fine and a one-year term of imprisonment. She concluded by urging the Government to immediately enact the amendments necessary for bringing the legislation into conformity with the Convention.

Kenya supports govt progress

he Government member of Kenya welcomed the information provided by the Government and noted that all of the pending issues had been addressed in some way.

There had been significant progress and commitment by the Government with regard to addressing and finalising the outstanding issues, including the urgent submission to Parliament of the bills to amend the Public Order Act and the Suppression of Terrorism Act.

A Code of Good Practice on protests, which was fully operational, had been completed through tripartite participation. The Public Service Bill and the Correctional Services Bill, which had been developed through technical cooperation,



were before Parliament, and comments from the ILO had been received on 24 May 2016. The speaker called upon the ILO to continue supporting the country with regard to the consolidation of the progress made and to the continuous improvement of industrial relations in the country.

waziland had appeared before the Committee since 1996 in relation to this Convention and Convention No. 98, which were fundamental to the architecture of international labour standards and to the dignity of workers in gener-

As indicated by the SAT-UCC at its 28 March 2016 labour symposium in Botswana, it was a struggle for workers and their civil rights to freely organise, associate and bargain without fear and interference. There could be no separation between the rights of workers at the workplace and in their communities, including freely expressing themselves as part of civil society and as human beings. The speaker also noted the report of the Minister regarding the 2015 conclusions of the Committee in this case and aligned himself with TUCOSWA concerning the progress in this regard.

However, progress within the legislative framework,

aimed at changing the problematic conditions, still needed to be confirmed in practice. The environment of hostility against civil society and other social forces, which related directly or indirectly to workers' rights, persisted and was characterised by the militarised political climate in the coun-

Progressive

The relationship between labour and civil rights could not be subject to a false dichotomy, as they were interdependent and one directly shaped or affected the other. Within the SAT-UCC and the rest of the international progressive trade union movement, it was clear that the convention concerned the rights of workers both as workers and as human beings. The speaker considered that the governments and employers of the SADC needed to honestly and consistently join the workers in their endeavour to free the region from workers' rights' violations.

LAWYER MANENE THW **BOWS TO KIRK PRESSURE**

anzini lawyer Manene Thwala did not pitch at the valuation court sitting at Matsapha Town Board chamber on Thursday after Matsapha businessman Tommy Kirk had moved that he recuses himself because he sat in the court and at the same time was a member of the valuation committee.

Immediately after swearing by oath Kirk reminded the valuation court before Magistrate Sindi Zwane that in the last sitting he had applied that Thwala should recuse himself from the case because he represented the town board at the valuation committee and therefore his contribution in the court would be biased towards the town board. Kirk is contesting the valuation of his properties by the town board, which include mainly portions of a farm in Matsapha within the precinct of the municipality.

"Because he sits in the committee I felt that he would be in conflict of inter-

However, Magistrate Zwane was quick to alert Kirk that Thwala was not present in court. She further explained the processes in terms of the law regarding conflict of interest and suggested that the court should proceed with the business of the day

However Kirk reiterated that "I just wanted to portray the character we are dealing with, the character we have issues with in other matters pending before the courts."

He then submitted a number of court cases to the court, which Thwala and Kirk are contesting as part of the evidence for his moving that the lawyer should recuse himself.

The crux of the matter in the Kirk properties is that they bear different values and are categorised differently each time Kirk is billed and therefore he feels the Matsapha Town Board has a vendetta against him for being vocal in matters of interest to ratepayers and the valuation of properties. Kirk further challenges the manner in which his properties are described, contending that the farm in question agricultural land yet the town board had claimed at some point that it was small holding.

Classification

The classification of the land under these categories has a bearing on the tariffs. Agricultural land is valued at 0.45% while smallholding is valuated at 1.5%, which is about three times more than agricultural land.

"Be patient with me because there could be a farce as these properties were valuated differently over a period of four years. For instance at one point it was claimed that the farm was equestrian which has to do with jockeys or someone who rides horses. I have cows and goats and no horses, not even a donkey on the farm." He then produced a definition of equestrian according to the Oxford Dictionary as part of the evi-

"Mr Kirk let us try and identify issues. I gather that this is a valuation court on property and land. I gather these issues were raised with the municipality. I ordered the municipality that since you had objected they must send to you a

corrected version on the uses of the property so that we are together on that one, if it is now corrected," said Magistrate Zwane. Kirk however submitted that he hoped the valuator would provide a clear definition as to whether the property was agricultural land, open space or smallholding.

"This is not the first time they are giving different values to the property. In 2013 they even wrote me that they had 'intent' to get back at me. The property was incorporated in 2012 but to date some of the values go up to 2000%. Obviously the valuator must be getting information from the municipality regarding categorisation and that is why they have also written 'use' to try and rip us off over the years."

Structure

Paul Malichi of Swaziland Realty Consultants said he was certain the municipality had to come up with the wording for the properties for a way forward. He said the municipality gave him a futuristic structure to work with hence the categorisation into open space, residential, commercial or industrial. He said he used comparable evidence from the same location therefore use or description did not have a bearing on the value hence he asked the owners of the properties to give the value as that of agriculture. However after giving examples of portions 692 and 693 where sales also took place, these being properties in the same location, Malichi agreed that if it was residential in Matsapha it would have changed to commercial or industrial category and the values would change. "But in this case we did not borrow the rates from the town."

Kirk interjected that "I said we were incorporated in 2012 and I've been in property in the industrial town for a long time but I have never come across such. Ours was not supposed to be an issue until I took other matters up and that is when they (municipality) came for me. You were harnessed into something you did not know. We also have properties in Malkerns where one is agricultural land and another is residential. Look we are trying to produce food here and now the country is experienc-

ing the El Nino phenomenon and we don't have food in Swaziland and beef is highly treasured for its protein. We are only asking this court to consider the property in question as agricultural land because that is what it is used for and then value it accordingly. But you have confirmed that you were told what to do." Malichi insisted that he was only an independent valuer and was not told what to do. He said market value remained market value . "You can ask for my opinion and this was not because of zoning, we didn't compare it to something else except for the properties in the area. It is not that someone told me to use a particular rate. I am not disputing your opinion presented before the court.

"We are trying to find a solution to this. Can't we just map out a strategy because we are also here as properties owners to give way to urbanisation. We can't resist urbanisation but don't push us this way unless you want to expropriate our land. These people are like the weather, they change with time. I just want to portray that I can't be made to pay up to 2 000% in rates. The issue here is the valuation. Let us find a proper formula for urban farms with a view to incorporate farms into residential areas," Kirk suggested.

Intervened

The magistrate intervened to say he picked that Malichi was furnished with wrong uses of the land hence the objection and therefore the municipality must produce the corrected uses. "Your argument is that these rates are not comparable because they are not the same. Are you suggesting a way forward with your own suggested values to consider or are you challenging these?

"Thanks for admitting that the classification on use is wrong and there is a problem. In smallholding the properties attract different values and when you say residential it also has a different value. In some properties you find a kraal and I am not Inkandla to be valuated in this manner. Work on the use, if it is agricultural it must be stated so but once you say it is a vacant plot it must be explained. Let us work together with the town board by finding a way of working things around."

After raising the argument Kirk however turned to declare to the court that he had already consolidated the properties and therefore the category of smallholding falls away. "I just wanted the court to know that Matsapha Town Board has been very vindictive towards

"I just wanted to help you (Malichi), let bygones be bygones. I am happy that more people are now seeing this. There is the KFC to the bridge road which cost the ratepayer E6 million but does not appear in the financials of the municipality. Most ratepayers do not know and the only one who knows it's me, maybe I shouldn't talk too much." "At one point the town board accused me of utfusa tinyoni tami, utalutfota lolumanti." The matter returns to the valuation court on July 27.

Catholic Church ventures into Swazi 'gold'

ith the Roman Catholic Church growing in leaps and bounds, the church has now ventured into a multi-million Emalangeni sugarcane farming project.

Located at the heart of the Lubombo region, the project covers about 427 hectares at St. Philip's Mission under KaNgcamphalala chiefdom. Since the church is involved in social responsibility drives countrywide, the project is aimed at assisting in the church's quest to reach to the less privileged within the communities it serves in the four regions of the kingdom.

When the late King Sobhuza II gave land to the Roman Catholic Mission in all the corners of the kingdom, he did so very well knowing that the church played a pivotal role in developing the Swazi nation as it does not only spiritually heals the Swazi people, but also affords education to all through schools that have

Catholics have schools countrywide meeting Government halfway in making sure that Swazi children get education and do not travel long distances to school.

Visited by the Observer on Saturday team this week, it was gathered that the project now employs more than 60 people, depending on the time of production and more than 90 percent of the people are from the local community.

According to Sakhile Ndwandwe, a priest from the Catholic Church, the employees exclude people who were involved in the initial development of the project and those who will be involved during the harvesting peri-

Ndwandwe explained that during the harvesting period, about 30 people would be engaged from the local community.

Since the project was initiated in 2015, this would be the first harvest as the Observer on Saturday found that part of the fields are almost ready for harvest.

Taking our team on a site seeing tour that lasted more than 30 minutes owing to the large scale of the fields, was the resident priest who said water is sourced from the Lubovane Dam, which supplies most of the sugar cane schemes within the

Ndwandwe said the church is not getting any financial assistance from any financial institution for the project. "The Church has been trying to farm the land and failing to make progress because of funding and lack of water, in trying to look for financial assistance from donors and local banking institutions, the church failed," Ndwandwe explained.

He said the project eventually kicked off last year after discussions with Illovo Ubombo Sugar

fter failing to secure funding from donors and banking institutions, for a long period of time, the church engaged Big Bend's Ubombo Sugar Company, otherwise known as Illovo for as possible partnership in 2015.

After several discussions with Illova which is one of the largest sugar producing companies in the country, funding was secured to the tune of E47 million.

Sakhile Ndwandwe explained that they moved from pillar to post trying to secure funding from local bankers and other financial institutions, but failed to secure same, until they engaged the company with the E47 million having a concessional repayment period, hence the project kicked off last year.







JUDGE MUMCY DLAMINI'S JUDGMENT

dispute of facts on motion proceedings – Plascon-Evans Rule – referring matter to trial will not shift equilibrium – marriage regime – speculation or failure to institute divorce or report bigamy not proof that party was not married in terms of civil rites – children born of bigamous relationship not illegitimate –

Summary: The applicant seeks for a declaratory order against first, second and third respondents. She contends that prior to deceased marrying the said respondent in terms of Swazi law and custom, he had contracted a civil rites' marriage with her. The first, second and ninth respondents are ferociously contesting the application.

Issue

[1] On the cumulative reading of the pleadings before me, the issue for determination is whether the deceased did contract a civil rites' marriage with the applicant. The main question for determination herein is whether the applicant was married to the deceased in terms of the civil rites. If the answer is yes, then what are the ramifications on the subsequent marriages in terms of the law?

Point in limine

[2] The respondents have raised a point of law which is seriously opposed. They submit that the matter is infested with serious disputes of facts which can only be resolved on oral evidence.

Legal principle on point of law

[3] The classicus case of Plascon-Evans
Paints (TVL) Ltd v Van Riebeck Paints (Pty)
Ltd (53/84) [1984] ZASCA 51: [1984] (2) All
SA 366 A [1984] (3) SA 623; [1984] (3) SA
620 (21 May 1984) which led to the PlasconEvans Rule is very apposite to the issue at
hand. The court cited de Villiers JP and
Rosenon J in Stellenbosch Farmers Winery

(Pty) Ltd v Stellenbosch Farmers Winery (Pty) Ltd 1957 (4) SA 234 at paragraph J as follows:

".... where there is a dispute as to the facts, final interdict should only be granted in the notice of motion proceedings if the facts as stated by the respondents together with the admitted facts in the applicant's affidavits justify such an order ... Where it is clear that facts, though not formally admitted, cannot be denied, they must be regarded as admitted." (my emphasis)

[4] Sometimes the respondent may deny a fact alleged by the applicant. In such instance, the court is guided:

- by the question of whether such denial raises "a real, genuine or bona fide dispute of fact", as it was so clari fied in Room Hire Co. (Pty) Ltd v Jeppe Street Mansion (Pty) Ltd 1949 (3) S.A. 1155 at 1163-5; or
- the court may elect to call the deponent to the respondents' affidavit for cross examination provided an application by the respondent has been made;
- iii) In deciding the application to call for cross examination, the court may exam ine the denials or allegations by respon dents with a view to ascertaining whether they are not;

a) "far-fetched; or

- b) clearly untenable that the court may be justified in rejecting them." Botha AJA in Associated South African Bakeries (Pty) Ltd v Oryx & Vereinigte Backereien (Pty) Ltd And Andere 1982 (3) SA 893.
- iv) The court may consider the application by inquiring as to whether referring the matter to trial will shift the equilibrium.

Determination

[5] I have carefully read the founding affidavit and more particularly the answering affidavits filed by the first, second and ninth respondents (respondents) who elected to oppose the applicant's application. It is my considered view that the respondents base their opposition on two grounds I intend to fully demonstrate.

[6] Firstly, the respondents dispute that the applicant was ever married to the deceased in terms of the common law regime. They contend that applicant and deceased married each other under Swazi law and custom as can be seen from the following:

"4. According to my knowledge and belief, the applicant was married to the deceased in terms of Swazi law and custom." (as asserted by first respondent).

"20. According to the best of my knowledge and belief, she was married to the deceased according to Swazi law and custom as well." (by second respondent)

[7] Second respondent similarly avers that deceased could not have contracted a marriage in terms of the civil rites as he demonstrated hatred of such marriage and further at a meeting held in his lawyers' office over the question whether or not he had married, applicant in terms of civil rites, deceased denied the same. She then states at paragraph 3 page 46:

"I am only aware that applicant was married in terms of Swazi law and custom."

[8] There is another affidavit filed in this matter. It is titled: "opposing affidavit" by one

Linah Loziga Magagula (born Dlamini). The basis for Linah to file this affidavit in this manner is not clear because she is not cited as a party to the proceedings. However, second respondent did refer to her in her answering affidavit. I will assume that this opposing affidavit was intended to be a confirmatory affidavit although it is not so couched in its body. I will nonetheless consider it as applicant did not object to it. She too attests that applicant was married in terms of Swazi law and customs. She repeats first and second respondents' attestation in support of the view that applicant and deceased married under Swazi law and custom.

Eighth respondent

[9] Eighth respondent applied to join issue. His application was granted by consent of the parties. He is described as an executor following a will executed by deceased. Like first, second respondents and Linah, he asserts that applicant was married in terms of Swazi law and custom. The reason advanced are that applicant never contended during the lifetime of deceased that she was married in terms of civil rites. Applicant also did not challenge deceased for marrying first, second and third respondents.

[10] I now turn to the second ground for opposing applicant's application as contended by the respondents. First respondent contends:

"Besides accepting me, the applicant condoned the deceased's action of taking more wives and this is evidenced by the fact that she never instituted divorce proceedings."

[11] Second respondent similarly attest:

"Applicant did not issue legal proceedings for divorce throughout the lifetime of deceased. If indeed the civil rites marriage lasted for 53 years and Applicant concealed it therefore the conclusion that Applicant embraced and accepted polygarny is an irresistible conclusion. She effectively condoned what deceased did in marrying the three wives and having children therefrom." (my emphasis)

[12] She repeats at paragraph 3.7 page 48: "I deny the contents of this paragraph, and aver that Applicant condoned the relationships and had embraced polygamy as a way of life in the Dlamini household."

that applicant condoned deceased's breach. What was this breach? It was a breach in terms of the contract that applicant intends to uphold viz. the civil marriage. Effectively respondents are saying there was a civil rite marriage and applicant condoned deceased's action of breaching it by concluding marriages in terms of Swazi law and custom. I say this because respondent would not argue the presence of condonation in the absence of any admission to the existence of the civil rights marriage. Condonation presupposes the existence of a contract and in casu, it is the civil rite marriage.

[14] I have already pointed out that the only factual finding that the court needs to establish in this matter is whether the applicant was married to the deceased in terms of civil rites. The rest turn on the position of the law. Having demonstrated that the respondents themselves in their own answering affidavits admit that applicant was married under civil rites, there is nothing that is disputed as a fact. This means there is no real and bona fide dispute of fact

and therefore the matter should not be referred to oral evidence. In the words of Plascon-Evans Rule, the equilibrium shall not be shifted by referring the matter to trial.

The merits

Did the applicant contract a common law regime marriage?

[15] The applicant asserts that she was married to the deceased Richard Themba Dlamini in terms of common law marriage on 5th August 1960. The certificate of marriage is attached to her founding affidavit. I have already highlighted the answers by respondents to the applicant's sworn statement.

[16] The respondents have taken two views. They assert that applicant was married to deceased in accordance with Swazi law and custom. They also attest to applicant's condoning deceased action thereby effectively admitting the existence of a civil rites' marriage. In other words, they are saying the marriage is non-existent and at the same time saying it is existing. These two grounds are opposite to each other. They are mutually destructive. They cannot hold. It is for this reason that we say in law a party cannot approbate and reprobate at the same time. In the language of Justinian "ambigua responnio contra proferetem est accipienda" (an ambiguous answer is to be taken against him who offers it). For this reason alone respondents' submissions stand to fall.

[18] Second respondent pointed out that at one time deceased was asked by his attorneys, now my brother, the Justice of this court, as "to whether or not the deceased had married applicant by civil rites' and deceased denied this." By reason that this question was directed to deceased on the marriage regime, and not just about any of the wives but specifically applicant' type of marriage, it appears to me that this matter was a bone of contention even during the lifetime of the deceased. The affidavit filed by my brother Mlangeni J who was then deceased's attorney, confirms this as he deposed:

"One of the many instructions I had from him was to draft a will. At this stage I had become aware that there was a dispute regarding the marital regime of his first marriage. In one of the consultations we had at his home at Mahlanya, I specifically asked him whether his first marriage was by Civil Rites or in terms of Swazi Law and Custom. He unequivocally stated that his first marriage was in terms of Swazi Law and Custom. His first

wife is the Applicant."(my emphasis)

[19] The averment that applicant's marriage regime was never an issue during the lifetime of deceased flies on the face of respondents in view of the above deposition. It is not clear therefore why respondents, together with Linah say that they learnt for the first time that applicant was married to deceased under civil rites' marriage when they were in the offices of fifth respondent. If ever they did, it is then evidence that they did not know the deceased very well which is contrary to what they firmly attested to in their affidavits. Now that the applicant has produced evidence of her marriage viz. marriage certificate, the matter which commenced during the lifetime of deceased stands to rest.

Condonation

[20] Having found that applicant was married under common law, the question is not whether applicant did condone the deceased's subsequent action of marrying the first, second and third respondents but whether the action of deceased could be condoned in terms of the

Marriage regime

[21] The applicant asserts that she was married in terms the Marriage Proclamation under Chapter 133 of the Laws of Swaziland. Section 10 which stipulates:

"10. Any person who is married, whether such marriage took place within or without the Territory, and who enters into a second marriage before the dissolution of the first, shall be punished with imprisonment not exceeding three years."

[22] Subsequent to chapter 133 section 10,in 1964 the legislature in Swaziland enacted the Marriage Act No.47 of 1964. Chapter 133 was therefore no longer operative in the Kingdom. This new piece of legislation carried similar provisions as the Marriage Proclamation, Chapter 133.

[23] Swaziland recognises two forms of marriage regimes, namely civil rites' marriage and the marriage in terms of Swazi law and custom. This position is inferred from section 7 of the Marriage Act No.47/1964 (the Act) which reads:

"Person already married.

 7. (1) No person already legally married may marry in term this Act during the subsistence of the marriage, irrespective of whether

that previous marriage was in accordance with Swazi Law and Custom or civil rites and any person who purports to enter into such a marriage shall be deemed to have committed the offence of bigamy: Provided that nothing contained in this section shall prevent parties married in accordance with Swazi law and custom or other rites from re-marrying one another in terms of this Act.

 (2) No person married in terms of this Act shall, during the subsistence of the marriage, purport to contract a legally recognized ceremony of marriage with any person other than the lawful spouse of the first-named person.

 (3) Any person who contravenes sub-section (2) shall be deemed to have committed the offence of bigamy."

[24] Section 7's promulgation is to the effect that parties intending to contract a marriage may, among themselves marry under both regimes. The section prohibits a party who is married under the civil rites regime to marry a third party under any of the regimes. It however allows a man married under Swazi law and custom to marry another woman in terms of the same regime. In other words, the Act recognises that our jurisdiction is patriarchal in terms of Swazi law and custom marriage only as it provides for polygamy.

[25] Turning to the case in casu, Linah-Loziga Magagula (Linah) attested that applicant was married to the deceased in terms of Swazi law and custom where applicant was smeared with red ochre during her traditional wedding. First, second and eighth respondents attested similarly. However, a material averment is lacking and that is the date of the said marriage.

This date would assist the court in determining whether the applicant's together with the first, second and third respondents' alleged Swazi law and custom were concluded prior to the 5th August, 1960.

If this was the case, it would have meant that the marriage of the 5th August 1960 to the applicant would have been invalid in terms of section 7 of the Act. However, this is not the evidence before me. I must pose to mention though that from reading the entire answering affidavit, the respondents could not testify of the date of the said Swazi law and customs marriage by applicant because the basis upon which they assert that applicant was married under customary law is mere speculation. For instance, they say that if applicant was married under common law, she would have filed for divorce and would not have accepted their wedding gifts or would have absented herself from their own traditional weddings and etcetera.

[26] I therefore accept that applicant was married to the deceased on 5th August 1960 as supported by the certificate of marriage filed herein. I note that eighth respondent has alluded to the certificate as "fraudulent". Eighth respondent's assertion stands to be rejected for a number of reasons. Firstly, the reference to fraudulent is not asserted with precision but so stated in passing as he puts it as follows:

"I wish to highlight that it is applicant that caused the confusion by submitting a fraudulent civil rites' marriage certificate at thenext of

[27] Further, no further averments are stated which support such bold allegation. Eighth respondent fails to shed light on how, where, when and by whom was the certificate subjected to fraud. Eighth respondent's averments in this regard stands to fall.

[28] Second respondent alleged some irregu-

larities on the face of the certificate. For instance, that the certificate does not reflect the full nan a of the marriage officer except to state that it was S. Papin; is without designation order; is silent as regards the law governing the proprietary consequences; and it fails to show the order of marriage.

[29] It is my considered view that the discrepancies, if at all, pointed out by the second respondent, do not vitiate the marriage that took place on the 5th August 1960. Applicant's application is further fortified by annexure at page 14 which is a certificate copy of entries to the Register of Marriage. This certificate copy is evidence that on 30th September 1993, a date ex facie appearing on it, the civil rites' marriage between applicant and deceased was registered in the register held by Government for that purpose. At any rate, applicant secured an affidavit from the Priest confirming applicant's marriage in terms of the civil rites.

[30] The averment that applicant ought to have protested, filed for divorce or laid a charge of bigamy against the deceased also has no bearing on the fact that applicant contracted a civil rites' marriage with the deceased. Although not so expressly stated, it appears to me that the respondents are raising estoppel. Ebersohn J. in Swaziland Sugar Association vs Eis Marketing (Pty) Ltd (1974/04) [2006] SZHC 148at para 25 pointed out as follows: "The person who pleads estoppel has to establish that he acted on the faith of a representation made to him by the represent or and that, in doing so, he altered his position to his detriment."

[32] Addressing a similar point F. X. Rooney J as he then was, having found that the subsequent marriage was null and void and the stated: "The first applicant is prima facie guilty of the crime of bigamy and now seeks to undo his own unlawful act."

[33] The learned Judge then cited the English case of Hayward as follows:

"It seems to me that it would be contrary to all principle if a ceremony which is by definition null and void could be converted into something valid and binding and capable of conferring status by the act or inaction of a party to it. It would surely be remarkable as a proposition of law if this court were to be e prevented from declaring the truth, namely that a marriage is bigamous, and so correcting the status of the parties to it and of their dependents merely because one or both of them has chosen to assert its or validity or because one of them failed to dispute or has concurred in the assertion of its validity by the other." (my emphasis)

[34] Simelane v Simelane and Others (NVLL) [1997] SZHC 69 (06 June 1997) Dunn I had a share on this subject as he articulated: "Once it is accepted that a marriage that is null and void ab initio is a non existent marriage, which does not require a formal act of annulment to deprive it of effect, it is difficult to see why the guilty party should be precluded from having this proclaimed by the court. On the contrary, it clearly in the public interest that the question whether or not there is a marriage should be settled once for all, never mind at whose instance.

Status is, by its very nature, indivisible: there is a marriage or there is not. The application of estoppels to a void marriage would lead to the absurd result that a marriage could be both existent and non-existent: existent as far as those are concerned who are estopped from asserting its validity; non-existent as against the

world. I am, with respect, in agreement with the views expressed by the learned author.

There is further, the rule referred to by Mr. Khumalo that public policy does not permit estoppels to operate in circumstances where its application would produce a result not permitted by law. See Rabie, THE SOUTH AFRICAN LAW OF ESTOPPEL p105. The defence of estoppels is not open to the 1st respondent in this case." (my emphasis)

[35] In the final analysis, the marriages between the deceased, first, second and third respondents are null and void ab initio by reason that they are bigamous in terms of section 7 of the Act. It would be remise of me not to point out the arbiter words of Dunn J in Simelane (supra) at page 4:

'The rule that a marriage which is null and void ab initio is without legal effect and cannot be ratified in subject to a number of exceptions, one of these being the case of putative marriage. If the requirement for such a marriage are met, certain of the effects of a valid marriage may attach to it. For example, the court may, on application, declare the children born of the marriage to be legitimate."

[36] I must point out that in casu, the children born of first, second and third respondents are legitimate by virtue of section 31 of our Constitution (2005) which abolishes the status of illegitimacy over children.

[37] The rights of the children born out of the union with deceased and the first, second and third respondents are not adversely affected by the finding of this court to the effect that their mothers' marriages to the deceased are null and void. In fact, in terms of section 31 of the Constitution, the children of the first, second and third respondents from deceased enjoy the same status as that of applicant.

[38] By no means in terms of the preceding paragraph do I pronounce by inference on the rights of the first, second and third respondents over their proprietary rights. Dunn J in Simelane supra also pointed with regards to putative marriages, "Application may also be made to court for orders relating to the property rights of the parties" subject of course to proving that the marriage was putative. That is not the case before me.

[39] In the above cumulative circumstances, I therefore enter the following orders:

- 1. Applicant's application succeeds;
- 2. The purported marriages between the late Richard Themba Dlamini to first, second and third respondents are bigamous and therefore hereby declared null and void ab initio;
- 3. Fourth respondent is hereby directed to expunge all entries in the marriage register in respect of the late Richard Themba Dlamini and first, second and third respondents;
- 4. Costs of suit to be paid from Estate late Richard Themba Dlamini.


The shortage of text books force learners to share resources amongst themselves or with their teachers during lessons. He was very optimistic that the situation will improve following the donation of the new text books.

partnership between the two organisations and described it as a very profound one since it is based on the principles of promoting education and knowledge which is the key responsibility of her company.

Opportunity

donated by MacMillan at the Staff College library to develop themselves educationally in order to be productive at work and life in general.

Apart from the Vulamasango School offering formal education to children in conflict with the law and children from neighbouring communities, hundreds of Inmates in the different centres are currently pursuing their studies in different levels of the education system. Whilst current enrolment at Vulamasango School stands at 465 learners, the number of inmates pursuing education studies in the different centres is above 200.

Skills

They begin their education journey from Basic Education where they are taught basic English and SiSwati writing skills and numeracy, to read, write and be able to count and do personal budgeting.

The other step is Post Basic Education level which prepares learners for the None Upper Primary Level (NUPE). This is equivalent to the Grade Seven course. Apart from the learners doing studies at NUPE level, there are also learners pursuing their education at high school levels; form 3 and form 5 and will seat for their final exams as private candidates. In Matsapha alone there are 77 inmates currently enrolled for education. Out of the 77 learners, 4 candidates in STD Five, 10 in Form Three and 7 in Form Five will sit for their final examinations this year.

In 2002, the late Senator Themba Richard Dlamini, otherwise popularly known as Phakama, was amongst the staunch traditionalists who was vocal against the planned purchase of the Bombardier Global Express State Jet.

I remember him for that.

But 14 years later and about three years after his death, we are still talking about him. This time around it pertains to the court challenge by his first wife Sarah, who as we all now know, successfully filed an application against Dlamini's three other wives as bigamous and unlawful.

Her major defence is that she was married through civil rites to the deceased on August 5, 1960 at the Catholic Church in Mbabane.

She proved it by submitting her valid marriage certificate to the court.

No one within the Dlamini family disputes that Sarah was indeed the first wife of the deceased, even though arguments have been advanced in court disputing the civil rites marriage.

But without any other evidence brought before court other than the marriage certificate from Sarah, the court ruled in her favour.

But today, I want to argue the case for the three other wives on behalf of the late Senator, who all of a sudden despite having been married through customary law, are now considered to have been in an invalid union or marriage.

Dlamini's senior wife is within her rights to do what she did, but I would like to challenge the court in this matter to have viewed this matter differently.

Firstly, the bigamous and unlawfulness of Dlamini's marriages to his three other wives did not occur at the time of his death.

Further, I want to argue that all his other three wives were not married on the same date or even year.

So I am saying therefore, the first day Phakama took the second wife, Nokuthula Makhanya of Mchaphozini (1983), Sarah should have raised the flag and ran to court to challenge this union. We have no record that she challenged it neither did she advance that argument in court.

Then she was quiet again when Dlamini, her wedded husband, married through Swazi law and custom Jenneth Tholakele Sihlongonyane of Mahlanya and the fourth wife, Cecelia Gcinaphi Makhanya of Ezulwini.


To me this says Sarah accepted that her marriage in civil rites was no longer valid and had in fact been reduced into customary marriage.

This I say because she never challenged Dlamini then and therefore cannot turn around today to claim the three other marriages were null and void.

If such were to be allowed, we would say, her actions are not motivated by her argu-

ment of having been married to the late through civil rites but by greed in that she now wants to be the sole beneficiary of her late husband's estate.

Injustice

If this judgment were to be allowed to prevail, it would be injustice to the three other wives, who have con-

tributed morally and otherwise to Phakama's estate and for the kind of man their husband became.

It cannot therefore be that a 54-year-old marriage certificate can all of a sudden change the set-up of the entire family. For all his active and gainful years, everyone, including his wives and children, accepted that their father was polyga-

mous and in lawful union with his wives.

Not even the judge's assertion that the children would not be affected by this judgment when it comes to the estate, attempts to heal the wounds created by this civil rites marriage certificate.

It cannot be that the lives of the now socalled illegal wives can be at the mercy of their children.

This judgment, if allowed to stand, is messy and contradicts everything Swazi law and custom stands for.

The certificate that Sarah produced in court

was a civil rites marriage, not a Roman Catholic Church marriage certificate, as she tried to argue that as Catholics they are not allowed to divorce.

Contravenes

In civil rites marriage, there is divorce in an event one party contravenes their marriage

vows.

The late Phakama can argue that he too had no intention to separate with his first wife despite that they had some differences hence he proceeded to take other wives, a situation Sarah accepted and permitted.

Dlamini could argue his move to marry not one but three other women after Sarah was a clear indication that he did not want to be bound by the civil rites

marriage agreement, something his first wife did not have a problem with.

One would implore the office of the attorney general to pursue this matter to the supreme Court, where a determination on the status of the three wives will be clearly defined, taking into account their constitutional rights.

If the office of the AG could take a matter of a private citizen, Bhoyane du Pont in his case against the Swaziland Building Society to defend individual's property rights, surely Majahenkhaba Dlamini can, irrespective of the judge who issued the judgment, take this Swazi law and custom issue to appeal.

It cannot be that one can decide not to challenge the existence of bigamy and unlawfulness nature of her marriage whilst her husband is still alive but be allowed to take advantage of the situation once one partner dies.

Justice calls for a review of this situation and that if Sarah remained quiet about her rights whilst her husband was still alive, she must live with the consequences of her nonactions.

If we objected strongly to the Sibusiso Shongwe and Michael Ramodibedi styled estate policy, I see no reason why this judgment cannot be challenged on human rights grounds.

One is not averse to civil rites marriages per se, but Swazi law and custom should not be made inferior and its points must be argued fairly and not be dismissed on the basis that someone happens to produce a paper that says she was married first.

Yes, we accept that she was married first through civil rites but she decided to forgo all her rights the day she allowed the three other marriages to go on uncontested.

She was not going to argue for divorce as she puts it, but would have challenged the basis of her late husband's actions on the basis of their marriage certificates.

No one said Phakama wanted a divorce, but only changing the rules of the game on the basis of their situation as it existed then, Period!

AFRICA INSIGHT

n June 23, British voters participated in a referendum in which the question was: "Should the United Kingdom remain a member of the European Union or leave the European Union?"

The 'Leave' campaign secured 51.9 percent of the vote, in contradiction to poll projections which had suggested a marginal victory for the 'Remain' camp.

Turnout was 71.8 percent, meaning more than 30 million Britons cast their vote. The surprise result catapulted global financial markets into turmoil, weighing on risk assets in the wake of the shock to confidence, leaving analysts and traders to recalibrate economic and financial models amid heightened uncertainty about the path ahead.

Strictly speaking 'Brexit' refers to Britain actually leaving the EU, which will not happen for some years at least, but in what follows the word is used to refer to the referendum result and the uncertainty it has provoked.

Short-term impact on the immediate impact on Africa was largely contained to the continent's most sophisticated market, South Africa, weighing on both the fragile rand and the Johannesburg Stock Exchange (JSE).

Due to the depth of liquidity and range of financial market instruments, South Africa is viewed as a liquid risk proxy for the sub-Saharan African (SSA) region. By contrast, external spill-over effects to the rest of the continent were considerably more muted and largely contained to the more liquid sovereign credit and currency forward agreements.

Still, volatile global risk sentiment and systemic risk concerns brought forth anxieties with regard to the potential impact on Africa in the wake of the unprecedented Brexit vote.

In our view, the direct impact of Brexit on Africa will be contained to the forex and financial markets over the short term.

This will primarily filter through to the real economy via the indirect impact of global risk sentiment on commodity prices, impacting the balance of payments and the monetary system, and implying that the upside risks to inflation have increased on account of exchange rate pass-through.

This pertains in particular to the case of South Africa, where we were already expecting continued monetary policy tightening. Thin liquidity conditions and idiosyncratic risks limited the immediate impact of global market malaise on African financial assets, although we anticipate increased volatility in the spot and forward rates of commodity price-sensitive local units.

We view the currencies most at risk from external headwinds as the Zambian kwacha, the Angolan kwanza, and the Ghanaian cedi.

In turn, the CFA franc zone, under the two common monetary unions (the Central African Economic and Monetary Community, CEMAC, and the West African Economic and Monetary Union, WAEMU) is implicitly vulnerable to EU developments via the impact on the euro exchange rate.

CEMAC and WAEMU peg their currencies to the euro at the same rate. In recent sessions, the impact on the Zambian kwacha was mitigated by cyclical factors as tax obligations brought about an increase in forex supply.

In addition, the price of the red metal found reprieve as markets started to expect that US monetary policy will turn more dovish; this has weighed on the dollar index, and this has aided copper futures in recent sessions.

Nonetheless, in our view the kwacha remains vulnerable to spill over effects from Brexit via the copper price, considering the red metal's position as barometer of global risk sentiment due to its prevalence in industrial processes.

Heightened global risk aversion, via the risk sensitive copper price, will weigh on the kwacha (in our view on forward rates more than the spot rate) during the latter half of the year.

The oil price fell by 8.3 percent from polling day until Monday, June 27. Depending on political developments, market uncertainty may continue weigh on the oil price, and as a result we estimate that forex tail risks have increased in both Angola and Ghana.

Both countries struggle with structural twin deficits, which introduce a structural months

While the oil exporter has requested financial and technical support from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), we anticipate that further devaluations may be on the cards should global demand for crude oil fall substantially below market expectations.

As for Ghana, our baseline expectation is for a pick-up of volatility in the cedi during the latter half of the year on account of rising exogenous problems and the apex bank's reduced ability to intervene on the forex market.

That said, we estimate that forwards priced in a too-large depreciation, and project that by the end of the year the local unit will be trading just below GH¢4.1/\$.


This is in consideration of another tranche of IMF funds under the \$918m three-year agreement and syndicated loan inflows aimed at the cocoa sector by October, partially counterweighed by lower sovereign credit inflows.

Risk to the Kenyan shilling come from the shock to global confidence, extensive trade links between Kenya and the UK, and a decline in the domestic real interest rate, but we think tepid trading activity and conservative central bank liquidity management will keep the shilling's depreciation modest in H2.

We anticipate that the shilling will trade at around KSh106.95/\$ by year-end. The renegotiation of trade deals may however add to structural depreciatory pressure on the shilling, and a lower UK growth trajectory may oscillate on Kenyan soil due to

reduced demand for Kenyan export

In addition to the impact of confidence erosion on commodity prices, we anticipate that de facto tightening of financial conditions may impede the attainment of sovereign credit targets of fiscally-fragile African countries.





SWAZILAND'S GOD FATHER OF THE DECKS - DJ XTRA LUV

Terence Ginindza, popularly known as DJ Xtra Luv, is one of the best DJ Swaziland has ever produced.

L&E had an mind blowing session bringing back to life the moments of this iconic deejay Swaziland has ever had.

He was born in the 70s at Ezulwini in Swaziland and comes from a family of three boys and two girls. He is married with two girls and a boy.

"I grew up playing soccer at school level and my parents refused me the opportunity to play soccer at club level due to the fact that my older brother sustained severe injuries while playing for an established soccer team and the fact that they felt it will distract me from my education which to them was a priority. They gave me what they never had and I am grateful for that," recalls Terence.


"The restrictions revealed my other talent for dancing, which then developed into my passion for music. At high school I had friends that were into break-dancing.

We used to carry big portable sound systems during schools' competitions and we used to battle it out on the streets," elaborated the iconic deejay.

ROLE MODELS

His role models were Michael Jackson, Janet Jackson, and Lebo Mathosa. "My older brother gave me his radio so at night I will tune in to Radio Bop, Radio Metro, SBIS 2 and Radio Thohoyandou. That's when I developed passion for radio as well.

Two local radio DJs inspired me to love radio. I enjoyed their presen-



tation skills while on air that was Mfundo 'Baby B' Mdzebele and the late Masu Masu Fakudze who I ended up co- presenting a music show on our local radio station with," he informed.

DEEJAYING AT THE WHY

As soon as he completed his high school level of education in the late 80's, he got a job at the Happy Valley Hotel as a trainee chef. He started collecting music, playing at friends parties using cassettes.

When Happy Valley management decided that the Texas bar, their middle class bar, needed a resident deejay in the mid 90's, he applied for a transfer.

Being the dedicated person that he was it was not easy for management to allow him to work at the disco completely but he was requested to do double shifts, to deejay at night and work at the kitchen during the day.

All three deejays had to alternate between the Why not disco and the Texas bar.

That arrangement did not go down well with the other deejays; they felt he should be placed at the Texas bar but the director, Mr Norbert Schmidt insisted that he be given the opportunity to gain experience in the disco.

"I remember one day he asked them why am I not appearing regularly at the disco, what they did was they normally gave me an opening slot when the disco was still empty. The support that I got from him was tremendous hence I never disappointed him.

"The fortunate part was that the



Why Not disco had professional turntables so I mastered the art of mixing on my own.

I used to come in early before time and go through records and make my selection and start practicing. None of the deejays there knew how to mix," he explained.

From there on there was no looking back for Terence Ginindza as he was determined to make this arrangement work and that's basically how Terence became DJ Xtra Luv in the music industry.

EDUCATION


According to Ginindza, his family believes that education is key to success so he enrolled for a diploma course in Creative Writing which included short story writing and Journalism. He also did a course in Sound Engineering.

He did some freelance work for a local magazine, The Nation in the Entertainment section. Because of his busy schedule he could not continue with his contributions.


The sky was the limit for DJ Xtra Luv after he was confirmed as a full-time deejay. He started organising some entertainment events for the club. He confesses that some were successful while others were flops.


"I used to learn from those mistakes. There was an incident that still haunts me, I organised a talent search which was well marketed but when it comes to execution it was not good just because of a sound system let down.


We had booked a group from South Africa to come and perform in Swaziland and bring

they were not coming on the day we had agreed on, so I had to find an alternative sound system locally at the eleventh hour. The sound was below standard, it was disappointing actually," said Ginindza.

BIRTH OF STREETJOY PRO-MOTIONS

As a young person his desire to succeed never ended there, he established an entertainment company, Streetjoy Promotions, a company which he founded in late 90s. streetjoy, specialises in sound system, stage and sighting hire services, events eanagement, artists, deejays and dancers management.

In 2000 he left the Why Not Disco to concentrate on his company. During this period he did private shows, had a short stint at the Club Y2K before moving to E1 Paradiso for a year and a half before it closed down. As he was in good terms with the Why Not's Management, he was asked to come back to the Club in 2003. His company was contracted to do events for the club until it was sold to new management in 2007.

SPRITE DJ OF THE YEAR

In 2004 he entered a deejay's competition, organised by Swaziland Beverages which was held at House. On Fire.

He was crowned Sprite DJ of the year in 2004 and went on to represent Swaziland at the regional competition final which was held in Zambia, all expenses paid, where he competed against other 10 African deejays. He became Second Best Central Africa DJ.

DJ Xtra Luv had team up with Swaziland's top deejays to form DJ PIONEERS. They are DJ Crooks, Wicked, DD Cool and Shadow who was the spokesperson for the Brand.

CLUB LEZONE

In 2010 together with his friends



Sandla Msibi, Sonkhe Kuhlase, Comfort Mkhombe, Phesheya Dlamini, Muzi Dlamini, Thulani Mthethwa they opened a club called Club LeZone, which became an instant hit among revelers until the places closes down due to some business challenges.

From there on DJ Xtra Luv has been doing Corporate Events through Streetjoy Promotions whereby he specialises on sound system hire, stage and lighting hire services, events management, artist, dancers and deejays management. DJ Xtra Luv initiated a marketing concept for his brand, Safa Bunandzi tour-loosely translated having a good time. The countrywide musical tour was featuring local and international seasoned and upcoming DJs and artists.

"It's all about reaching out to my fans and promoting new talents" said the soft spoken DJ.

This was a way of thanking his fans for support and promoting talent.

This iconic deejay has groomed quite a number of deejays some of which are well known but they are too proud to mention his name during their interviews that he had contributed to their craft.

"I will only mention them when they first acknowledge my contribution" insisted the deejay.

Deejays he has proudly groomed are; DJ Krome, the late DJ Akeem, DJ Six Nine, DJ Madmax, DJ 2shot, DJ Chuidy, DJ Flava, DJ MixMash, DJ M' Andie, DJ Carlos, The Trendsetters Djs who I am currently promoting and many more.





AFRICA INSIGHT

In light of international risk aversion, structural imbalances and the lack of fiscal space to commit to new projects, we think that Ghana may struggle to drum up sufficient appetite for a new sovereign credit offering this year.

On the other hand, performance of outstanding sovereign credit is seen under pressure in 2016 H2 should Brexit concerns weigh on commodity prices throughout this

Included in our base view is a revision of assumption with regard to the resumption of US interest rate normalisation.

Whereas we pre-Brexit anticipated a July rate increase in the US, we now think that the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC) will - in consideration of global financial market turmoil - stand pat on tightening until December.

While negative market sentiment internationally will resonate across commodity price-sensitive African sovereign credit (including in Gabon, Senegal and Nigeria) we think that Ghana and Zambia, which both hold elections during the latter half of the year, are most at risk of yield jumps and heightened volatility in the medium term.

Idiosyncratic risks relating to off-balance sheet debt will keep Mozambique's sovereign credit performance largely dependent on developments on the debt and foreign aid front.

Longer-term impact

The longer-term impact of Brexit is far harder to forecast, given all the variables that will play a role.

The political situation the UK is very fluid. Prime Minister David Cameron announced on June 24, that he will resign as soon as his Conservative Party picks a successor for him. Nominations for this position opened on June 29, and it sounds as though the Conservatives will have a new leader by early September.

Three contenders have a strong chance of winning the position: Boris Johnson, the former Mayor of London, Justice Secretary Michael Gove and Home Secretary Theresa May.

Johnson was a prominent figure in the Leave campaign but considerations of party unity may lead the Tories to appoint Mr

The early reaction from the EU has been predictably vindictive, and it is probable that the EU will press hard to ensure that, if Brexit happens (which some credible commentators, like the Financial Times's Gideon Rachman, doubt), the ensuing relationship will look like the pre-

Relief for Mugabe?

Europe-wide sanctions on regimes could be reassessed without British involvement and in some cases this is cause for celebration. Zimbabwean ruler Robert Mugabe is reportedly convinced the U.K. is responsible for restrictions that have cost the slumping economy tens of billions of dollars, and that other member states will be more co-operative. Other sanctioned regimes such as Libya could also seek re-appraisal.

Setback in Somalia

The African Union Mission in Somalia (AMI-SOM) has been key to checking the progress of East African jihadist militant group al-Shabaab in Somalia and beyond.

The body is funded through the EU but British efforts have been key, contributing servicemen and logistical support to the struggle. European leaders recently voted through a cut to the Mission's budget, which could signal a policy of retrenchment as they look closer to home. This would come as a boost to the terror group.

Some political African groups in Britain cam-paigned to leave the EU partly on the basis of the hated Common Agricultural Policy, which allows subsidized European farmers to dump cheap goods on African states and imposes tariffs to prevent trade going the other way. The Policy has been described as neo-colonialism, and a severe hindrance to agricultural development across the continent. A weaker EU may struggle to retain the same grip on the market, and British officials have hinted at a fairer deal for African farmers outside the Union

As it will not be able to limit migration from the EU for some time, it may decide to score political points (perhaps in anticipation of being unable to deliver a genuine Brexit) by limiting immigration from the rest of the world.

Nigeria and South Africa are the two African countries that would be the most affected by this: 2.5 percent of migrants in the UK were born in South Africa, and 2.4 percent in Nigeria, according to the Migration Observatory at Oxford University.

These percentages translate to absolute numbers of 209 000 and 200 000 respectively. Anecdotally, judging by comments on social media and by people who speak to reporters, many of these people are now nervous about their future prospects for residency and work opportunities in Britain, and they are probably right to be.

Leave campaigner Nigel Farage (the leader of the UK Independence Party, UKIP) said on Friday that the UK would now be looking at "maybe re-engaging with the Commonwealth," but we doubt

that it will work out this way.

There was a definitely element of racism in the Leave campaign, which was most obvious in its choice of a poster showing a row of Arab migrants in the final week of the campaign.

Since the vote outcome, again on anecdotal evidence, it appears that racists in England have begun to feel empowered by the outcome, and there appear to have been more incidents of racist violence and insults than usual, targeting Poles and people who are visibly Muslim (in many instances, British-born ones) especially.

Direct economic effects flowing from lower demand from the UK and Europe will, we think, tend to be slight.

These effects will also be limited to the countries that are most open to the British and European economies.

Morocco for instance, experiences a 1.8 percent increase in exports, and a 2.32 percent increase in FDI stock, if EU GDP goes up by 1 percent. So the slowdown in the EU and UK as a consequence of Brexit will have some slight effect on such economies and will be disruptive to firms that export to these countries, and to FDI-driven expan-

But here it is again important to reiterate that the longer-term consequences of Brexit are unknown and impossible to forecast, seeing that we do not even know when the negotiations that will determine the relationship between the Isles and the Continent will begin.

WHY DO WE CARE?

The surprise Brexit vote once again underlined the adverse impact of unexpected events on the fragile global economic system, and warned that external headwinds may arise from new sources.

In our view the short term impact of Brexit will largely be contained to liquid forex (forward and spot) markets and sovereign credit, although this will increase upside risks to inflation due to the first and second-round effects of exchange rate passthrough.

Economies may need more aggressive monetary policy tightening to rein in growth in consumer prices and to anchor inflation expectations.

For fiscally-fragile economies, balance of payments pressures will quicken the pace of foreign buffer erosion, and may necessitate further reduction in growth positive infrastructural investment.

We consider a deepening of the commodity price slump as unlikely, although this outcome would inevitably increase pressure on the fiscus and terms of trade insofar politically-sensitive recurrent costs would need to be cut.

Tight external financial conditions and constrained domestic liquidity conditions in SSA will act as an additional drag on growth this year.

In the longer term, it is too soon to say what Brexit's impact will be. While Brexit has added to volatile global risk sentiment, we continue to view systemic risk from China as the singular most salient source of external risk to Africa's economies.

A sharper-than-anticipated pace of economic slowdown, or sectoral rebalancing, in the Asian economic giant will have effects on African soil via large direct (bilateral trade) and even larger indirect channels, due to the shock to the regional terms of trade in light of depleted foreign buffers and inadequate policy reform.


Some people may also wish to wake up during the night to test their blood glucose levels to see if they're experiencing high or low blood sugar overnight.

"Sometimes it's just walking. And you don't have to walk vigorously. Smell

the roses along the way."

Don't be a perfectionist about it. Let's say you wanted to exercise every day but you missed a couple of days. "Don't beat yourself up for that. "Give yourself credit for the days you did walk."

Instead, ask yourself what would help you do better with your goal in the future. Find ways to make it happen.

"If you expect perfection, then you're going to be disappointed a lot of the time." If you're looking for steady progress, then you can see that."

5. Get more ZZZs.

Skimping on sleep at night can leave you feeling irritable and stressed. It can also hurt your blood sugar control.

Look for chances in your day to tap into that. Watch happy, uplifting movies and avoid tearjerkers, and "surround yourself with joyous, happy people.

From Diabetes - Related Fatigue to Healthy Living

Because of the great amount of management it takes to live a healthy life with type 2 diabetes symptoms, you're likely to experience a lack of energy at times. The more complex your diabetes, the more you'll need to do to keep your blood sugar levels in normal range. And the more work you have to do to control blood sugar levels, the more tired you'll likely become.

But as you continue to become more educated about diabetes, with as much support as you can get from family and friends, you'll begin to adjust to eating better, exercising more, sleeping better, and keeping your blood sugar levels in check. Once you've made the choice to be healthier, you'll find yourself less fatigued and more energised.

One of the initial signs of prediabetes is fatigue. When insulin resistance develops, the body is unable to use sugar, the body's main source of energy. When glucose stays in the bloodstream, keeping blood sugar levels high, it can cause fatigue.

Prediabetes risk factors such as obesity, poor nutrition, and lack of exercise, poor sleep and stress can also cause fatigue. Dehydration from increased urination can contribute to feelings of tiredness as well.


iabetes mellitus – or sugar diabetes – is common in humans and is also a common illness of dogs and cats. Much of the food that is ingested is broken down into glucose, a type of sugar in the blood and one of the body's main sources of energy. Blood sugar is maintained by a group of hormones, the most important of which is insulin, which is manufactured by the pancreas, a small organ near the intestines.

Appropriate insulin function will trigger the liver and muscles to take up glucose from the blood cells, converting it to energy. When the body fails to metabolise sugar, blood sugar levels rise. Uncontrolled elevation of glucose leads to dehydration and body chemistry disorders that can eventually cause coma and death.

Diabetes mellitus usually affects obese dogs and middle-aged to older dogs of either sex, however it is twice as common in female dogs as in males. The peak age seen in dogs is seven to nine years. Juvenile-onset diabetes may occur in dogs less than one year of age.

Any breed can be affected but some breeds are at increased risk (e.g. Australian terrier, Samoyed, Schnauzer, Bichon frise,

Two types of diabetes

There are two basic forms of diabetes: type I and type II. Type I is caused by absolute deficiency of insulin due to an insufficient number of insulin-producing pancreas cells. Type I ('juvenile-onset diabetes') represents the most serious form of the disease. Effective treatment for type I diabetes requires a combination of controlled diet, regular exercise and daily injections of insulin to maintain a regular blood-sugar level.

Dogs are most often affected by type I diabetes and rarely have type II.

Adult onset or type II diabetes is the more

common form of diabetes in people. Type II occurs when enough insulin is produced but something interferes with its ability to be utilised by the body. Type II diabetes is treated with a combination of diet, weight control and medicine that makes cells more sensitive to insulin. This form of diabetes is observed more often in cats than in dogs.

What to Watch For

An affected dog will be constantly hungry, since glucose is not making it to the brain; glucose levels in the brain are too low for the brain to register that it is receiving food. Because insulin is not giving the muscles and organs the signal to convert glucose to energy, the excess glucose in the blood will be carried out of the body in urine instead of

being used for energy, and there will be a concurrent lack of energy. There is also increased thirst as a result of the increase in urine. The liver is adversely affected by this condition, as are the eyes (cataracts are common in diabetic dogs and cats) and kidneys.

Early signs:

- Increased thirst
- Increased frequency of urination
- Hunger
- Weight loss even with normal appetite Later signs:
- Loss of body condition
- Lethargy and depression
- Vomiting.

Although they can be produced by other cause, when increased thirst and urination are observed, diabetes should always be considered. Most pet owners notice that their diabetic dog drinks excessively and has a need to go outside more often.

Treatment

The first step in treating the disease is getting a correct diagnosis. This requires a veterinary examination and appropriate tests, such as a urinalysis and blood glucose determination. Diabetic pets, like people, need medical care.

Most dogs' and cats' diabetes can be managed without complications if you carefully observe your veterinarian's recommended diet and exercise (for dogs) routines.

Which standard to implement

ver the past two decades a lot of Management Systems standards have been published by standardisation organisations.

These include international, national and private standards. Given the multiplicity of standards that organisations have to comply with, it may sometimes be hard to choose the most relevant to your particular industry.

This is compounded by the fact that there are generic management systems standards, sector-specific management systems standards, product-specific and regulatory standards that must be complied with.

This myriad of requirements may make it hard for an organisation to choose the management systems standards that will enhance their strategic business advancement through the use of standards.

Besides the regulatory requirements that companies should adhere to, there are voluntary standards which when placed as contractual requirements to suppliers make them quasi-regulatory requirements.

As a result most suppliers without certification may lose out on some business opportunities. In a bid to be seen to be standards and quality conscious, organisations may implement standards that may not necessarily best serve their needs for the specific industry sector.

The choice of which standards to implement then became critical as we discussed last week that there are costs associated with certification to standards.

In general, your criteria for selecting a management system standard to implement will depend on the following considerations:

- Do you need a generic system focusing on a management area or a sector-specific system?
- If you are aiming at a generic system, what area do you want to focus on: quality, the environment, information security, or a combination of these?
- If you need a sector-specific system, in which field do you operate: medical devices, packaged food products, automotive fuels?

To help focus your thoughts, I will highlight some of the popular generic management system standards and the purpose of implementation.

ISO 9001, Quality management systems

- To obtain customer satisfaction by consistently providing conforming products or services

ISO 27001, Information security management systems – To ensure the security of your company's valued information and create confidence among customers in the security of the information they provide

ISO 14001, Environmental management systems – To demonstrate to your stakeholders that your company is environmentally responsible

OHSAS 18001 (ISO 45001), Occupational health and safety manage-

ment system – To provide a safe workplace to your employees by managing occupational health and safety risks at the workplace

ISO 50001, Energy management system

To improve energy performance, including energy efficiency, energy use and consumption. There are some sector-specific management systems standards such as those for food safety. This sector is heavily regulated and is largely governed by Sanitary and Phyto-Sanitary measures as it also involves the use of agricultural produce. The more common voluntary standards include:

HACCP, Hazard analysis and critical control points – To ensure that the food your company processes is safe for human consumption

ISO 22000, Food safety management system – Also FSSC 22000 (a combination of ISO 22000 and PAS 220) is to ensure the safety of various food items, i.e. those manufactured from animal products, perishable vegetable products, products with long shelf life and food ingredients like additives, vitamins and bio-cultures.

BRC Global Standards – To ensure the production, packaging, storage and distribution of safe food and consumer products
GLOBAL GAP – These are private stan-

GLOBAL GAP – These are private standards that are widely useful for farm producers looking to tap into export markets, especially in Europe. They help to reassure consumers that food is produced on farms that minimise the detrimental environmental impacts of farming operations by reducing the use of chemical inputs and that apply a responsible approach to worker health and safety as well as animal welfare A company may wish to have a manage-

agement areas, such as quality assurance, environmental safety and food safety. It may be possible to combine a generic standard and a sector-specific standard such

ment system that integrates several man-

standard and a sector-specific standard such as the ISO 22000 standard and BRC Global standards.

An Integrated management system of generic standards is also possible as most of the standards have common features, such as control of documents and internal audit requirements. What is most important is that companies identify the management system/s that best meet their need to demonstrate their commitment to quality to their clients. The international standards (except the private standards) discussed above have been adopted as national standards by SWASA and are available for industry to use. Since most of these are technical, organisations sometimes find it difficult to implement the systems on their own. SWASA does provide training on understanding and implementing the standards for SMEs and large industry.



- To avoid spoilage, do not return unused milk from a serving pitcher to the original
- Milk can be frozen for up to 6 weeks without any impact on its flavor and nutritional value; however, upon thawing, it can be separate and lose its smooth texture. Thaw milk in the fridge.

RECIPES

Poppy seed cake

3/4 cup (180ml) poppy seeds 1 1/2 cups (375ml) flour

2tsp (10ml) baking powder

3/4 cup (180ml) butter, at room temperature

4 eggs

3/4 cup (180ml) sugar

Itsp (5ml) vanilla essence

1/2 cup (125ml) sour cream

Preparation

- Preheat oven to 180 C. Butter and flour an eight cup (two litre) tube or bundt pan. Turn pan over and tap to remove excess
- Using a grinder and working in batches, grind poppy seeds to a fine meal. Combine with flour and baking powder.
- In a bowl, using an electric mixer, cream eggs, sugar, butter and vanilla at medium speed for four minutes or until pale vellow.
- Add sour cream and mix gently. Pour batter into pan and bake in the middle of the oven until a paring knife inserted in the centre comes out clean, about 45 minutes.
- Cool 10 minutes on a rack before removing cake from pan.

Fried ham with milk gravy

2 (1/4 inch- thick) center - cut, fully cooked ham slices about 300g

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

1 cup vegetable oil

1 cup milk

1/4 tsp salt

1/8 tsp pepper

Preparation

- Rinse ham slices in warm water, dredge in flour, reserving two tablespoons for gravy. Fry ham slices in hot oil in a large skillet over medium heat for four minutes on each side or until golden brown.
- Drain well, reserve two tablespoons oil
- Add reserved flour to skillet, cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, and two to three minutes or until flour is lightly browned.
- Gradually add milk, cook until thickened and bubbly.
- Stir in salt and pepper.
- Serve ham with gravy.

Now that you know that there are way more benefits to drinking milk than you thought, you might be wondering if it matters what kind you drink. The short answer



Inancial Inclusivity has been termed as the back bone for effective small business development especially in African countries like Swaziland.

The significants of this trend in doing business has been influenced by the high poverty levels, which have crippled the establishment of sustainable businesses in most African countries, including Swaziland.

African Development Bank (AfDB), (2013) averts to the fact that the concept of inclusive growth is multifaceted and has financial inclusion as one of its main building blocks for socioeconomic growth and development.

For sustained and inclusive development to thrive, a great deal of innovation and planning is needed to ensure that appropriate financial services and instruments are put in place for the benefit of the poor and other vulnerable groups.

Financial inclusion is a multidimensional concept that encompasses all initiatives, from both the supply and demand sides, within the financial sector.

They include provision of appropriate and quality financing that is both accessible and affordable to low-income and other vulnerable households. Notably, they target groups traditionally excluded from the formal financial sector.

The definition of financial inclusion

Several authorities have defined financial inclusion from various perspectives but pointing towards the same outcome.

However, from the socioeconomic perspec-

tive, Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) understands
financial inclusion as a process of ensuring
access to appropriate financial products and

manner by mainstream institutional players.
The notion behind this idea is that for poverty levels to have been managed, it is important that people have the access to resources
that would be used to enable them meet
their personal demands.

In the same light, Center of for Social and Economic Rights (2014) declares that the need to combat inequality features prominently in African countries and remains a matter of urgency. This is because equality and inclusion are essential for the eradication of poverty and integral to human development. CSER (2014) continues to state that the elimination of poverty in all its dimensions remains the overriding priority.

and a necessary condition for sustainable development. It is for this reason that innovation is to revolve around factors that would influence this development. Eradicating extreme poverty, with no one left behind, will not be possible without promoting equality and inclusion, which includes reducing income inequality, and promoting equality of opportunity and outcome.

A human right agenda

The idea of creating a social system that allowed people to have easy access to vital means of livelihood can also be termed as a matter of promoting human rights. This concept has been recognised by International labour organisation under the theme: the "future we want" conference that was held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia in the year 2015. The conference declared that to ensure empowerment of excluded groups, such the informal business sector and partic-

ularly the women, specific barriers like those that had a dimension of social status, like women's access to finance must be eliminated. Instead it was declared that these people (women and girls) were to have equal access to financial services, and the right to own land and other assets.

The understanding behind this notion has been that indigenous peoples' rights should be fully reflected in-line with the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples, regardless of their socioeconomic context.

This notion has been debated and concluded that these socioeconomic sectors were to be cross cutting of which entrepreneurship is at the center of it.


In particular, people's rights to their land, natural resources and territories, and to the benefits associated with their traditional knowledge should be protected. This would then mean that people were free to decide which sector was ideal for them, to remain sustainable and progressive.

The idea of establishing an ideal entrepreneurship society, in which people were free to engage in business in this case, would remain solemnly a challenge for government to deliver.

Based on this notion, it is important to state that the impact on social, economic and cultural rights in any given context remains to be embedding within human rights at the core of the sustainable development agenda. Which means, at the very least, respecting and reflecting pre-existing human rights norms, standards and commitments in the sustainable development goals.

News24 is still waiting for a response from Meistre.

The South African government earlier condemned the "cowardly terrorist attacks".

DA, EFF slam each other in Nelson Mandela Bay

ORT ELIZABETH -The race for the hotly contested Nelson Mandela Bay Metro is hitting boiling point.

Politicians from the major parties campaigned in Kwazakhele on Thursday and spent time slamming each other with insults and accusations.

Residents made it clear that they didn't want to be sweettalked, ahead of next month's municipal elections.

In the latest eNCA poll, the African National Congress has recovered some support, but the Democratic Alliance is still way ahead of the governing party.

"Every five years the elections passes, they promise they will do this and that, after that you will never see them again," said Nothemba Nikani, a

Ramaphosa settlement resident. Democratic Alliance leader Mmusi Maimane accused President Jacob Zuma of using

the SABC to try and capture the state. "Jacob Zuma is fundamentally corrupt. He can't tell the truth when it's blatantly before him," he said.

Maimane also offered to resign if he doesn't deliver on his promises. "I'm so invested in the DA, we the DA must deliver and if we don't, I myself will resign," he told residents of Booysens Park. "We are the only government that can deliver, the ANC has long neglected the people. Our focus it to create work particularly in the Northern Areas because people just don't find work," Maimane said. DA mayoral candidate Athol Trollip said that it was unacceptable that residents had to choose between rectification or the rebuilding of their houses.

"It's not a choice, there are thousands of houses built so poorly that we will have to rebuild them. A lot of them have to be completely demolished.

Home Affairs supports petition against homophobic pastor

retoria - The Department of Home Affairs has expressed support for the online petition meant to stop American anti-gay pastor Steven Anderson from coming to South

However the department says it may not have the power to deny him the

The petition, which had already gained over 2 000 signatures by Thursday morning and has since grown to 5 000, is meant to lobby Home Affairs Minister Malusi Gigaba to deny Anderson entry on the grounds that he may be coming to SA to "promote hate speech". "We fully support the online petition. We will take it to the Human Rights Commission," Home Affairs spokesperson Mayihlome Tshwete told City Press.

However, he said that it may prove

difficult to stop the pastor from coming to SA because the comments he allegedly made were not stated on South African soil. "If someone from another country says something whilst not in the country we have no power to

stop them from coming," he said. It was announced earlier this week that Anderson would host an event on September 18 in Kempton Park.

But the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Intersex (LGBTI) community in South Africa is against his visit, saying he was coming "to bring his unique brand of hate to South Africa". "This cannot be tolerated or allowed as LGBTI rights are protected by the Constitution, and there is already enough homophobia - the flames of which do not need fanning," stated the petition posted on change.org

After the June 12 massacre at Pulse nightclub in Orlando, Florida in the US, Anderson posted a video in which he said there are "less paedophiles" in the world. Forty-nine people were killed in the mass shooting at the gay nightclub.

Denel denies capture by Guptas

OHANNESBURG -State-owned defence conglomerate Denel on Thursday sought to refute allegations that it had been co-opted by the Gupta family to give a R1billion contract to VR Laser instead of LMT Holdings, which has cried foul and turned to the high court. "Denel wish to respond to the adverse reporting which was carried by certain publications today," Vuyelwa Qinga, Denel communications officer said in a statement. "Denel categorically deny that it

is captured by the Gupta family." Earlier on Thursday, Times LIVE reported that a South African military contractor had raised allegations of state capture before the Pretoria High Court. The shareholders of LMT Holdings filed an urgent application on Wednesday to challenge the awarding of the R1 billion contract for the Hoefyster programme to VR Laser.

LMT Holdings is a local vehicle engineering and manufacturing company that is 51 percentowned by Denel.

LMT Holdings founder Stefan Nell alleged that, according to the contract, LMT would be awarded the design and manufacturing contracts for the Hoefyster project, which would generate an estimated income of approximately R100-million a year for a period of 10 years.

The deal was ratified by the Treasury and the minister of public enterprises in 2012.

Project Hoefyster produces a wheeled "Badger" infantry fighting vehicle, or the new generation infantry combat vehicle, for the South African National Defence Force (SANDF).

But Nell, in court papers, argued that there had been political motive and meddling to ensure that Denel awarded the remaining Hoefyster contracts, previously promised to the LMT Holdings, to VR Laser, which is affiliated to the Gupta family and President Jacob Zuma's son Duduzane. Africa News Agency

ConCourt victory for Solidarity in key affirmative action case

OHANNESBURG - The Constitutional Court has ruled in favour of trade union Solidarity in their court case against Department of Correctional Services. The union had challenged the department's implementation of affirmative

action plans, alleging that ten of its

members were denied promotions because of their skin colour.

Ruled

The court ruled that seven of the ten Western Cape correctional services staff should be appointed to the positions they were eligible for, and ordered that their pay scales be back

dated to reflect this change.

Last year arguments were made on whether affirmative action policies must use regional or national demographics and whether numerical quotas can be used for people from different race groups.

UN expects DRC election to be delayed

KINSHASA - The head of the United Nations mission in the Democratic Republic of Congo says he does not believe the country will be able to hold its presidential election as scheduled in November. Maman Sidikou told at a press conference on Thursday in Kinshasa that even a partial revision of the electoral register in preparation for the vote would take at least nine months, meaning the election could not be held until next year. Tension has been mounting in this central African country amid opposition claims that President Joseph Kabila wants to delay the vote so he can stay in power past his mandate, which expires at the end of the year.

Ugandan army goes into South Sudan

UGANDA - A heavy armed Ugandan military convoy crossed into South Sudan Thursday to evacuate citizens trapped in the capital Juba as fears persist that days of fierce fighting might reignite despite a ceasefire. The UN has warned of tension and the possibility of fresh fighting in Juba, where a ceasefire has held.President Salva Kiir vesterday called on arch-rival Riek Machar to meet for talks to salvage peace. "I don't want any more bloodshed in South Sudan," Kiir said. Kiir spoke in public for the first time at the bullet-scarred presidential palace.. AFP

Detained 'Boko Haram supporters' dying

YAOUNDE -Authorities in Cameroon have arbitrarily arrested more than 1,000 people as part of their fight against Islamist militant group Boko Haram and dozens have died

CAPE TOWN - Zimbabwean nationals marched to the Zimbabwean Consulate in Cape Town on Thursday to deliver a petition calling for President Robert Mugabe to step down. The march was sparked by the ongoing protests in Zimbabwe against Mugabe's government. The southern African country has in recent weeks been hit by a wave of protests, as Zimbabweans demanded that the government act on the ongoing economic hardships. The protesters in Cape Town also protested against the arrest of Pastor Evan Mawarire who has been leading the #ThisFlag movement. News24

Mali World Heritage site in danger

DAKAR - A World Heritage site in central Mali that features elaborate pre-Islamic mud houses is in danger of deteriorating because it cannot be protected adequately in the face of insecurity, UNESCO said. The Old Towns of Dienné includes four archeological sites with nearly 2,000 houses whose decorative facades have remained intact since the 3rd century B.C. The buildings are among the most famous in Mali, a country that also boasts the ancient town of Timbuktu. The World Heritage Committee said insecurity was preventing measures to safeguard the site against the deterioration of construction materials, urbanisation and erosion. News 24.

'NIGERIA'S ANTI-GRAFT WAR ONLY SCRATCHES SURFACES'

AGOS - There has been no shortage of praise for Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari's anti-corruption war, which has led to the arrest of a string of high-ranking former government officials,

The crackdown centres on an alleged \$2.1bn "arms scam", where money earmarked for weapons to fight Boko Haram is said to have been diverted for political purposes.

But experts say the arrests and ongoing trials do little to tackle systemic corruption in the defence sector that helped allow the Islamists to seize swathes of territory in the country's northeast.

Former national security advisor Sambo Dasuki is

accused of overseeing a sprawling embezzlement scheme that saw "phantom contracts" awarded for personal gain, as under-equipped and demoralised troops fought better-armed militants.

But Dasuki's trials have a narrow focus: whether defence money was diverted to former president Goodluck Jonathan's party to fund his failed 2015 re-election campaign.

Campaigners say none addresses the companies behind the procurement deals or the lack of oversight that makes the sector ripe for fraud, leaving the door open to future arms scams. "The major issues within the defence sector have not really been sorted,' Eleonore Vidal de la Blache,

from Transparency International's Africa defence and security programme, told AFP. "Just because you prosecuted a few rotten apples it doesn't mean that you've massively transformed the sector."

Secretive status quo Shielded by a secretive status quo, corruption thrived while Boko Haram tore through Nigeria in 2014, capturing territory the size of Belgium and killing over 2 500 people - one of the most bloody years of the insurgency, according to Human Rights Watch.

Nnamdi Obasi, a senior analyst with the International Crisis Group, said the problem was "particularly serious" in the defence sector as national security. AFP


Zim authorities deport Sky News journalists

ARARE - Zimbabwean authorities Thursday deported two Sky News journalists for entering the country without permission, a senior government official said, as the country faces a wave of antigovernment protests.

They breached our laws and we kicked them out. You don't enter a country without accreditation," said George Charamba, a senior official in the Ministry of Information.

Charamba, who is also President Robert Mugabe's spokesperson, told AFP that their deportation should serve as a warning to foreign journalists who may attempt to sneak into the country without permits.

The Media Institute of Southern Africa (MISA) said Sky News correspondent Alex Crawford and a cameraman, whose identity was not given, were arrested at a lodge in Harare on Wednesday. The media watchdog said the two were travelling on British passports and were detained overnight at Harare international airport before their deportation Thursday morning. AFP

Botswana declares drought a disaster

ABORONE -Botswana President Lieutenant-General Seretse Khama Ian Khama has declared the drought across the country a state of disaster and announced a drought-relief programme that will end next year on June 30.

In a proclamation order issued on Thursday, Khama said a drought assessment survev conducted by government

ministries revealed that the poorly distributed rainfall during the 2015/2016 farming season had left a significant number of rural households vulnerable to hunger. He said the drought, which affected the whole country, had also left the national livestock herd in danger of dying due to the scarcity of water and pastures.

Among other mitigation measures, Khama said government would provide food aid to drought-stricken families.

A schools-based feeding programme will help supplement nutrition among pupils in primary and secondary schools in the Okavango District, which is hardest hit. Livestock farmers will also benefit from a 25 percent subsidy on stock-feed prices, which will remain in place until 31 December 2016.

Possible delay to Ghana presidential election

CCRA - Ghana's presidential election may be delayed by a month, the head of the country's electoral body has said, after wranglings over voter registration.

Nationwide polls in which President John Dramani Mahama is seeking re-election were scheduled to be held on November 7 — a month earli-

er than initially planned. But the director of electoral services at the Electoral Commission of Ghana, Samuel Tettey, said the election could be on either date.

Conference

"In case 7th November goes through we can go by it. If not and it's 7th December, we can go by that," he told a news conference in the capital,

Accra, on Wednesday.

"So, both dates are possible but we are working towards 7th November general elections."

The lack of clarity over a date comes after 56,000 names were deleted from the electoral register after individuals used national health insurance scheme cards as proof of identity. AFP

Bashir welcome at Rwanda's **AU Summit**

IGALI - Sudanese President Omar al-Bashir, who is wanted by the world's top criminal court, is "very welcome" in Rwanda for a summit of the African Union starting this weekend, the country's foreign minister said on Thursday.

Rwanda has "no obligation" and "no right to arrest anybody" as it has not subscribed to the treaty founding the International Criminal Court (ICC), Louise Mushikiwabo said at a news conference. She also dismissed out of hand an ICC request, sent to the Rwandan government two days ago to help it arrest Bashir, calling it "a distraction".

"We are too busy to pay attention to that kind of thing," she said at the media conference held ahead of the gathering of the 54nation group. The summit takes place tomorrow and Monday.. "Rwanda is the host of African leaders invited by the African Union," she said.

"Unequivocally, anybody who is invited by the African Union will be here in Kigali and would be very welcome and would be under the protection of this country as should be customary." The ICC issued arrest warrants for Bashir in 2009 and 2010 for war crimes, crimes against humanity and genocide over the Darfur conflict, where more than 300 000 people have died, according to the United Nations. AFP.

FBI warns about 'terrorist diaspora' after ISIS defeat



WARNED: FBI Director James Comey.

Senior US national security officials on Thursday warned about a possible rise in extremist violence with the

spread of a "terrorist diaspora" once the Islamic State group in Iraq and Syria is defeated.

"We all know there will be a terrorist diaspora out of the caliphate as military forces crush the caliphate," FBI Director James Comey told a hearing of the House Homeland Security Committee, referring to the Islamic state proclaimed by the jihadist group.

Thousands of fighters will spread worldwide "and our job is to spot them and stop them before they come to the United States to harm innocent people," he added.

The ISIS group's defeat in Iraq and Syria will make it "desperate to demonstrate its continued vitality, and that is likely to take the form of more asymmetric attacks, of more efforts at terrorism", Comey said.

Estimated

CIA director John Brennan estimated last month that about 18 000 to 22 000 ISIS fighters remained in Iraq and Syria, and he predicted they would probably intensify attacks around the world even as they come under pressure in Iraq and Syria. The jihadi group has ceded an increasing amount of territory in recent weeks, especially in Iraq, where it lost control over the Sunni city of Fallujah and a major air base in Qayyarah, about 60km from the city of Mosul, the ISIS group's de facto capital in Iraq.

However, that has not stopped the jihadists from staging deadly attacks in Baghdad and elsewhere.

Although the Islamic State group's grip in Iraq and Syria is weakening, there may be a significant lag between the US-led coalition's battlefield victories and reducing the IS group's capability to stage attacks, Nicholas Rasmussen, director of the National Counterterrorism Centre, told the committee.

Brennan said on Wednesday that three suicide bombings in Saudi Arabia last week bear the hallmarks of ISIS. AFP

Car explosion kills suspect, injures one

NEVADA - Two explosions, at least one of hem set off by a bomb or bomb-making naterials carried in a car, rocked a small arming town in eastern Nevada on Wednesday night, killing a suspect in the vehicle and injuring another person, authorities said on Thursday. The circumstances behind the two large blasts at about 8 p.m. in the community of Panaca, about 190 miles (300 km) northeast of Las Vegas near the Utah border, were not immediately clear. The Lincoln County Sheriff's Office issued a statement confirming one fatality and one "non-life-threatening injury" from the first blast, which according to dispatcher Toni Lytle resulted from the detonation of explosives in the car. Reuters

Congress should strengthen refugee protections

NEW YORK - US Congress should pass legislation that would strengthen protections for refugees and improve the overall effectiveness of the asylum and resettlement process in the United States, Human Rights First's Refugee Protection Program Director Eleanor Acer said in a statement on Thursday." A strong, effective and fair asylum and refugee resettlement process is more important than ever as the United States looks to lead, and encourage other countries to do more, to address the global refugee crisis," Acer stated. According to Human Rights First, the current US asylum system has become increasingly inefficient due to a barrage of technical requirements. Africa News Agency

'Poverty at worst for 10 years in blow'

ROME - The number of people living in poverty in Italy hit its highest level for a decade in 2015, data showed on Thursday, in a report that could



hurt centre-left Prime Minister Matteo Renzi. Those living in "absolute poverty" rose to 4.6 million last year, or 7.6 percent of the population, up from 6.8 percent in 2014 and the highest since current records began in 2005, national statistics bureau ISTAT reported. *Times Live*,

Boris booed at ambassador's residence

LONDON - Boris Johnson was booed this afternoon at the French ambassador's residence despite singing La Marseillaise at a reception to celebrate Bastille Day. Making his first public appearance as British Foreign Secretary in London, a small section of the French and British crowd at the ambassador's residence heckled Johnson as he attempted to make a speech. Johnson's appointment as Britain's top diplomat has caused disquiet across Europe - even leading to the cancellation of an informal meeting of foreign ministers in Brussels to discuss the impact of Brexit. Johnson is due to attend his first EU foreign ministers' meeting in Brussels on Monday. Daily Mail

Up to 700 could have died in migrant disaster

SYRACUSE - Italian navy officials say that the death toll from the April 2015 migrant shipwreck could be close to the original 700 estimate. Admiral Nicola de Felice told The Associated Press on Thursday that forensic experts have gathered human remains in 458 body bags from the vessel retrieved this summer from the Mediterranean Sea floor, in addition to the 217 bodies recovered previously. It will take months to identify the poorly preserved remains, but de Felice said "the number of victims is likely to be higher" than the 675 total. Daily Mail

Fear Factor: Americans scared of presidential options

ASHINGTON - The vast majority of Americans say they are afraid of at least one of the two major candidates - Hillary Clinton or Donald Trump - winning the White House, a remarkable finding that reflects an unsettled nation unhappy with its choice. Nearly 81% of Americans say they would feel afraid following the election of one of the two polarising politicians, according to a new AP poll. That includes a quarter who say it doesn't matter who wins: they're scared of both. Three-quarters of voters say their pick for president is motivated by a desire to cast their Election Day ballot against Clinton or Trump, more than those who say they're voting for the candidate who shares their positions on the issues or is the most qualified to hold the office. On the eve of the summer's political conventions, at which the general election campaign officially begins, the latest poll findings underscore the deep sense of unease that is sharpening the political divide in America . AFP

S. China See ruling a 'crowning glory'

ANILA - A decision invalidating China's vast claims in the South China Sea was a "crowning glory" that renews faith in international law, the Philippines' top lawyer said yesterday, in Manila's strongest comment yet on its sweeping win. The remarks by Solicitor General Jose Calida follow two days of carefully calibrated responses from the Philippines and are almost certain to irritate China further. Manila has so far been keen not to rock the boat in the hope of starting dialogue towards Beijing allowing it to exercise what the Permanent Court of Arbitration in The Hague ruled were its sovereign maritime rights.

"It confirms that no one state can claim virtually an entire sea. The award is a historic win not only for the Philippines ... it renews humanity's faith in a rules based global order." AFP







Nagaoka told AFP in an interview after completing the 400 metres freestyle in 26 minutes, 16.81 seconds at a Japan Masters Swimming Association competition in Chiba, on the outskirts of Tokyo, "The secret is to eat well and stay active. It's no good sitting around at my age.

until I'm 105 - and beyond

that," added the Yamaguchi native, who has lived through 22 Olympics to date.

Nagaoka, who swam the race backstroke sporting a white cap and dashing black and gold swimsuit, finished well over 17 minutes behind the winner, 80-year-old Etsuko Azumi.

Roar

Hard of hearing, Nagaoka failed to hear the roar of the crowd after completing the eight-lap race and attempted to return for a ninth before being fished out by judges as nervous medics watched on. "It was just another race," smiled Nagaoka after changing into a pink jacket and matching hat.

"Swimming makes me happy, that's what I love about it," she added. "When I'm swimming I'm in my own little world."

despite the attack.

The Tour de France will continue in sobriety and with dignity. 'We wish today to be dignified, in trib-

ute to the victims. We are thinking about the families, we offer our condolences to everyone who has been affected, who has lost a loved

one. To everyone who is injured, in flesh and in their being. "We asked questions of ourselves, effectively. But we think, in agreement with the state authorities, that the race should continue, and we mustn't give in to pressure of people who want us to change our way of life." There was a minute's silence held at the start of yesterday's 13th stage, a 37.5-kilometres timetrial from Bourg-Saint-Andeol to La Caverne du Pont-d'Arc.







Pirelli wants Middle East F1 tests next year

IDDLE EAST - Formula One's sole tire supplier Pirelli wants preseason testing to be carried out in the Middle East next February, rather than at the usual Spanish tracks, to be sure of better weather.

"We would prefer to go somewhere like Bahrain or Abu Dhabi," Pirelli's motorsport head Paul Hembery told the official formula1.com website yesterday.

"The temperatures will be representative and we know the tracks very well. We definitely would want to go to representative tracks."

Pre-season testing, along with the launches of the new cars, has been carried out at Spain's Barcelona, Valencia and Jerez tracks in recent years to help teams cut costs and make logistics easier.

The early races of the season — Australia, Bahrain and China on the current calendar — are run in higher temperatures than found in Spain, where rain and chilly weather is not unusual at that time of the year.

Testing next year is more important than ever with significant rule changes coming in and Pirelli, who have started trying out 2017 compounds already, having to make wider tires for cars designed to go substantially quicker.

"If we have any surprises, if the cars then are very different to what we had envisioned, then we will have to react to that," said Hembery.

"Probably not for the first race, but at least when we have some really good winter testing we should know in advance how it is likely going to be - what changes are needed." Reuters

Argentina name Correa, Simeone in Olympic soccer squad

RGENTINA - Argentina have named Atletico Madrid's Angel Correa and Giovanni Simeone, son of the Spanish club's coach Diego, in the national soccer team for next month's Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro.


Correa is one of five players based abroad, including West Ham United midfielder Manuel Lanzini, Real Sociedad goalkeeper Geronimo Rulli plus forwards Jonathan Calleri and Lucas Romero, who play in Brazil for Sao Paulo and Cruzeiro respectively. Notable absentees are strikers Paulo Dybala of Italian champions Juventus and Mauro Icardi of Inter Milan after Argentina had serious problems securing the release of players for their 18-man Olympics squad.

"We got the team out with forceps," Argentina Olympic Committee (COA) president Gerardo Werthein told La Nacion after fearing last week he might not have a squad for the Games. Coach Gerardo Martino quit on returning from last month's Copa America in the United States, where Argentina's senior side were runners-up to Chile, after discovering he had just nine players confirmed in the squad for Olympic training last week. Julio Olarticoechea, who was looking after the under-20s, replaced Martino and will hope to become the second member of Argentina's 1986 World Cup-winning team to steer his country to the Olympic title after Sergio Batista in Beijing in 2008. The gold medal team in Beijing, which included Lionel Messi, retained the crown won by Argentina four years earlier in Athens but the country failed to qualify for the 2012 London Games. Keeper Rulli and Independiente defender Victor Cuesta, who made his senior Argentina debut at the Copa America, are two over-age players in the under-23 squad. Reuters



SRFA Chairman Enos Vilane screams sabotage

"The good thing about it though is that I will be given the platform to explain my side of the story and there are objective members who will back me in this matter," he said. Meanwhile SRFA Secretary Zanele Hlophe refuted the allegations that she hid some of the documents from the chairman. "This is far from the truth. I have never hidden any documents. The only letter that was not seen by the chairman is one that came through on Friday after business hours. I did inform the chairman of this letter even before the AGM on

Sunday," she said.
