



NEW MINISTER STOPS SIPA CEO, ORDERS WORKERS TO REMAIN CALM

THE Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade Jinnoh Nkambule, paid a visit to employees of the Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority (SIPA) to deliver a message from the new Minister Jabulani Mabuza.

The principal secretary visited the employees stationed at the SIPA headquarters before proceeding to the Mavuso International Trade Centre to meet the staff, largely made up of cleaners there.

Incidentally, the meeting by the principal secretary came just a day before the employees had planned to deliver a petition to the minister on various grievances pertaining to their welfare.

The newspaper has learnt that Nkambule informed the employees the minister had requested them to continue with their work and promised them their concerns were being attended to.

Nkambule told the workers that the minister said all their concerns had been forwarded to him and he was in the process of addressing them.

"We were told the minister was out of the country on official business, but he would come back to work on the problems engulfing the entity. He promised that the minister would start

from where the board of directors have left in addressing the problems. I have no idea whether the meeting had been intended to stall our plan to deliver a petition to the ministry on various issues that have not been handled by the chief executive officer and the board," the source said.

Grievances

The principal secretary is reported to have requested the employees to continue to work while their grievances are being attended to. He also reported that the minister was out of the country.

Nkambule was accompanied by the entity's Chief Executive Officer Phumelele Dlamini and Sandile Simelane, the Board of Directors' Chairman

The employees, it has been established, had planned to deliver the petition raising concerns they have not been awarded a cost of living adjustment for the year 2016, which stands at 4.9 percent.

The employees were also going to petition the ministry to demand payment of their outstanding overtime allowances for working at the Trade Fair for 2015 and 2016, among other concerns.

Comment

Efforts to get a comment from Nkambule were futile as his cell phone rang unanswered. The minister when called said he was in a meeting and referred all questions to the principal secretary.

On another note, true to his word, the new Minister Mabuza summoned SIPA's chief executive officer and directed her to stop all the disciplinary hearings against staff.

The meeting, the Swazi Observer has learnt, was on Wednesday before the minister left the country for a COMESA meeting in Madagascar and Dlamini was given a stern warning to stop all the pending disciplinary hearings against the cleaners.

She was also directed to stall the ongoing disciplinary hearing against Trade Fair Manager Nontsikelelo Hlatshwayo, who had been suspended about a month ago. An inside source has told this publication the CEO was further warned against addressing the problems engulfing the parastatal.

Asians frustrating Her Majesty's dream

EFFORTS by Her Majesty the Indlovukazi to liberate women from the grinding poverty are allegedly being frustrated by the influx of Asians into the country.

The Queen Mother's economic emancipation of Swazis, particularly women, is reportedly bound to fail due to non-availability of business space anywhere in the country.

A concerned Swazi, who has been at the forefront of the establishment of Her Majesty's initiative, Swazi Women Economic Enterprise Trust (SWEET) told the Asian probe team their members had failed to find business spaces

anywhere in the country.

"We even went to Swazi
Commercial Amadoda to
request that whenever their
members wanted to lease their
shops they should give priority
to our members but that is still
on the table, nothing has happened so far.

Rental

The information we receive is that the Asians offer exorbitantly high rental prices that shop owners could not resist," said the officer. The SWEET, she said, was now in the process of establishing a bank so their members could get funding at reasonable interest rates and without having to meet the tedious and unjustifiable conditions set by conventional banks.

Government spent E140 million on 2013 elections

THE Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) spent E140 million in the 2013 elections.

This is contained in the belated 2013 national elections report released last week.

The report revealed that the commission initially requested a budget of E241 million to cover the entire elections activities, however, government reduced it to E132 million which was further cut to E106 514 526. However, a supplementary budget of E33.5 million was added on the initial budget thus taking the whole expenditure to E140 million.

The commission's budget was fund-

ed under the normal budgeting system and funds were released on a quarterly basis.

The national elections also received funding and material support from co-operating partners and local business community.

Report

The report states that the budget covered for election management solution, purchasing of election material such as translucent ballot boxes, signage, branding of the commis-

sion's vehicles, information, communication material, electricity cables, electricity vouchers, allowances, hospitality and airtime. The reports states that the budget reduction was made on an assumption that government transport would be made available throughout the election period and that registration centres had electricity. "Other areas that were heavily affected by the reduction include, among others, the robust civic and

voter education exercise with the view to capacitating the marginalised groups, visibility and marketing of the 2013 elections. The proposed budget was intended to cover election material such as tents, sanitary equipment and

water supply. The budget also anticipated an increase in personnel and incentives thereof hence the need to revert to the 2008 allowances," he said

The money, the probe team was told, has been raised by mostly women through savings with the hope they would eventually venture into business and improve their economic stability. That, however, is not possible now because according to SWEET, every business space had been occupied by the Asians, both in urban and rural areas. In the city centres, the possibility that an indigenous Swazi could

operate a business are almost zero in that rental for a business space costs a ridiculously E36 000 to E60 000 per month. "How many Swazis, if there are any, could afford to pay such high rental fees?" the probe team was asked.

Empower

The officer said business workshops for local women were conducted to empower them but under the prevailing circumstances, all those efforts had been put to waste. The reason being that all the small-scale business ventures they wanted to venture into like fish and chips outlets, spaza shops, grocery shops, street vending of fruits and vegetables and more of the same had all been taken up by the army of Asian investors.

What the E33.5 m supplementary budget covered

THE Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) had a E33.5 million over-expenditure in the 2013 elections.

This is contained in the EBC 2013 national elections report.

The report reveals after the elections and through the 10th Parliament, government provided a sum of E33.5 million as supplementary budget to cover elections expenditure, especially transport and personnel costs. The report states that for the Central Transport Administration (CTA) charges the budget allocation amounted to E5.1 million yet the actual expenditure came up to E37.1 million.

"This catered for fuel consumption for vehicles as well as vehicle hiring services from the registration process to secondary election. The actual expenditure amounted to E37 110 531, resulting to a variance of E31 995 490," states the report.

Awarded

For this the commission was awarded a supplementary budget of E32 million. The report further revealed that per-

The report further revealed that per sonnel costs and miscellaneous allowances were under budgeted.

It states that there was an over-expenditure of E347 160 during the course of the election hence the need for a E1.5 million budget supplementary to cater

for the over-expenditure. The report further states there was also an overexpenditure on included professional services, which includes the Voter Registration Kits (VRKs), the election management software, technical support and maintenance during the election period, advertisements for the elections, printing of ballots papers, posters, brochures, pamphlets, rentals, food parcels, hotels and other relevant items. The actual budget was E20 642 894 and the actual expenditure was E20 990 054. Due to the large amount of printing during the 2013 national elections and the amount of advertising done on this item EBC overspent by E347 160.

Massive land eviction of Swazis by Asians

WEALTHY Asian businessmen are reportedly evicting Swazis in massive scales in the peri-urban areas in Manzini using money.

A senior resident of Manzini told the probe team Swazis were bought out of their land by the wealthy Asians who are hungry for and grabbing every available piece of land and space. Along the Manzini-Matsapha highway, most Swazis have been removed to pave way for import car dealers. "Some of them set up shops and most of them use the shops

just as a front for a host of dealing some of which are very shady criminal activities like drug pushing, human trafficking and money laundering.

That is why they don't mind making E50 a day in their businesses," said the concerned resident, himself a victim of the Asian influx.

Chiefs, he said, were of no use in this regard because they were also paid handsomely for facilitating and legitimising the deals between the Asians and their subjects.

CITIZENSHIP BOARD MEMBERS DEMAND BRIBE FROM FOREIGNER

TWO allegedly corrupt members of the citizenship board secretly approached a citizenship applicant asking him to 'make a plan' if he was serious about getting the much-needed Swazi citizenship.

The applicant, Amir Manzoor, originally a Canadian national, told the parliamentary probe team investigating the influx of Asians into the country he refused to heed the advice from the corrupt board members to 'make a plan'.

The committee is led by MP Titus Thwala.

Manzoor said he informed the citizenship board members they were at liberty to deny him the citizenship if they felt he did not qualify than see him make a plan.

The 'make a plan' here refers to offering a bribe for the members of the citizenship board to

The presenter said the board

members told him it was of paramount importance that he

made a plan because the King granted citizenship to a very limited number of applicants and to enhance his chances he had to do something by bribing his way

The probe team asked Manzoor what he understood the board members to mean by 'making a plan,' to which he said it was quite clear they wanted a bribe and he could not entertain that.

Refused

"I refused to be involved in any plan because I wanted to enjoy good sleep each time I went to bed, knowing very well I have not committed any crime," said the Canadian-turned Swazi.

He was, however, eventually distally granted citizenship after denouncing his Canadian citizenship and is currently running a car import business in

Matsapha with three Pakistani nationals.

He said he qualified to be granted the citizenship because he had been in the country for the required number of years in terms of the law and his investments were in excess of E20 million.

Probe

Asked by the probe team why he preferred Pakistani nationals as directors instead of Swazis, Manzoor said he had been asked that question several times by, amongst others, a cabinet minister.

His answer to this question, has always been the same each time that when you consider a business partner you look for someone who you share the same ideas with.

ROYALTY USED AS BUSINESS SECURITY

AN investor with strong Pakistani connections told the parliament probe team into the influx of Asians it was significantly important for them to associate themselves with royalty for the sake of

The investor said he had been on numerous occasions asked why they associated themselves with royalty.

He said such questions annoyed him because it would not help them befriending themselves with commoners when they had investments to protect and needed security for their investments.

The investor said at some point in time he was annoyed by a cabinet minister who asked him why they were associating with royalty. "I told him I wanted security for my investments and such was fundamental to me," he stated.

Though of Indian origin, the businessman said he did not like to be looked at as an Indian but instead a businessman.

"I'm not an Indian but I'm a businessman! What matters most is not the person but the project," argued the car import business investor. He said they have assets in the country which they accumulated with profits from their businesses.

The businesses themselves, he said, were

ASIANS ARE PROFIT DRIVEN

PEOPLE of Asian origin would continue to flock into the country for as long as the kingdom remained conducive for business.

This view was expressed by an investor of Indian origin who told the committee what brought them here were business opportunities and the desire to invest where they could safely reap profits. He said the same principle applied when selecting a business partner and what they considered most was the level of security and stability in the country. He said information circulating in the outside world was that Swaziland was a safe haven for investment, hence the influx of foreign nationals. These remarks confirmed what other presenters told the committee that the Asians flocking into the country were a product of the marketing campaigns for direct foreign investment the leadership of the country was

involved in.

According to an Indian who has already been granted Swazi citizenship, there was nothing wrong with foreigners investing in the country and even applying for citizenship.

All that matters, the Indian argued, was for the government to ensure it attracted the right calibre of investors and further maintained them.

Grant

He said the best form of maintaining them was to grant them maximum security in the form of citizenship so that even if the country's laws were changed to favour the locals, their investments remained in their hands.

"I can't generate ideas for all my life with the intention to earn a living out of them and suddenly lose them. Granting us citizenship, therefore, made it possible for us to protect our money, assets and ideas," he







DEADLY HAY: FARMER'S E550 000 INVESTMENT GOES DOWN THE DRAIN

A farmer who owned a herd of over 30 cattle is distraught after losing all but four of them due to the suspected poisoned hay.

Even the remaining four are likely to die.

It is the sad story for Zakhele Stewart Hlophe of Galile, past Mhlosheni under Shiselweni I Inkhundla, who in a short space of time has lost almost all his treasured

He reportedly invested thousands of Emalangeni to raise the herd not knowing one day they would all be wiped out by the deadly hay.

Hlophe, who is also a successful transport operator owning a fleet of kombis, saw a total of 12 cattle killed after being fed hay two weeks" ago. The latest deaths saw the number of cattle that perished reaching 26 after 14 more died last week.

Four are still struggling to walk as they have been lying in the kraal sickly for two weeks. He admitted he was left with little hope four would survive.

"It's a painful experience and I just feel crippled and confused. From those that have already died, nine of them were expected to deliver as they carried calves which I am sure were to be delivered this month or early next month. The kraal is now almost empty, which is quite strange

I bought the hay at Nhlangano Farmer's Training Centre and had I known I would have continued buying hay from South Africa, where I have been buying all along," said the businessman with a teary look.

Hlophe said veterinary officers had

been to his home to provide advice and also assist in saving the few remaining cows.

"They have tried to offer help such as applying certain medication like injection but sadly, such has not made any improvement as my animals have continued to die. Those

that I thought were going to pull through after the first batch also died last week.

I don't have any cow; I think it's better to put it that way. I no longer own a cow as you can see for yourself the kraal is empty," said Hlophe. But he did not want to shift the

visiting us with the aim of rescuing my animals but sadly, their efforts

Several of my other cattle are still showing signs they can die at any time," said Kunene. He had a total of 65 cattle before losing 11 after

blame to anyone at this stage and would also not want to blame himself for what has taken place

"I can't at this stage say who should I hold responsible. I can't blame myself as well for all what has happened and I just need to freshen up as I am still confused. I can't also say what steps I am considering taking," said Hlophe.

While he could not be exactly sure how much in total he invested in his animals, he stated the figures could be in the region of minus or plus E550 000. He said medication spent in all the animals was part of that figure.

"Each season, I have been reserving money for the vaccination of my cattle. For winter period, I have been spending a lot and even when it is summer, I also spend in terms of the medication required suiting that particular season.

Just at the beginning of August this year, I started buying hay as you know we are experiencing drought. have been fetching the hay from South Africa all along and it was just now I happened to buy it at the Nhlangano Farmer's Training Centre, which is closer," said Hlophe.

Another farmer loses 11 cattle

DUMISANI 'Zigi' Kunene, another father, has related how he lost 11 cattle after they were fed the deadly hay two weeks ago.

Kunene from Davies near Zombodze Emuva, said initially seven cattle died but now the number has increased to 11. He is also in the transport industry and owns Izigi Zendoda fleet of buses.

He was aware that on top of the 11 cattle, more were still to die.

Sickly

"As we speak, a number of others are still lying sickly in the kraal. They are all looking lifeless and

can hardly walk or eat. I see more of my cattle dying in the next few days as it's what has been taking place from the time they were fed with the hay I bought at the Farmer's Training Centre," said Kunene.

Even veterinary officials from the ministry of agriculture had been to his home to check on how some of the animals were coping.

"The veterinary officers have been seemed to have bore no meaningful

being fed with the poisonous hay.

He said the possibility of more dying cannot be ruled out.

"So far I have lost 11 and some of them were expected to deliver

We are still counting as we still have these ones lying motionless in the kraal and they are looking weak and unlikely to survive," said Kunene.

NMC ACCUSES MAIZE FARMER OF BETRAYAL

MAIZE farmers are reportedly betraying the National Maize Cooperation (NMC) by accepting thousands of emalangeni assistance only to later sell their produce to other companies.

NMC Chief Executive Officer Dumsani Msibi told portfolio committee members for the ministry of agriculture his company was doing a lot to support local maize producers. That assistance, however, Msibi said was

not reciprocated by the farmers.

Sigangeni based maize farmers alone, Msibi said, were given assistance amounting to E78 000 to produce maize with an understanding that after harvest they would sell the produce to NMC.

Much to the surprise of the government parastatal, the Sigangeni farmers took their harvest and sold it at Sidvokodvo, brazenly bypassing the NMC that had helped them produce it.

Msibi said these were not the only farmers who demonstrated a high degree of disloyalty to them but there

were many others. He said others were met half way with an assistance amounting to E150 000 but they, too, disappeared when they were supposed to deliver the produce at the market.

Msibi mentioned this information to the members of parliament to show to them his organisation was trying its best to meet Swazi farmers halfway in terms of assistance.

The parliamentarians were voicing dissatisfaction in the manner the NMC operated, accusing the entity of supporting South African farmers at the expense of local maize producers.

Swazis enjoy 80 percent transportation quota at NMC

MSIBI further dismissed as unfounded allegations by Shiselweni II MP Mthokozisi Kunene that there was favouritism in the allocation of transport contracts for hauling the company's imported products from South Africa.

Msibi said Swazis enjoyed the highest quota in the distribution share of the transport contracts with a reserved 80% share while foreign businesses benefitted only from the remaining 20%.

The contracts to transport the

maize, he said, were between the maize sellers in South Africa, where they sourced the maize, and the transport operators.

He explained that the role of the NMC was only limited to ensuring the quote was maintained.

Failure to stick to it attracted an additional E3 000 conalties to the supplier, an amount that demonstrated the seriousness by the NMC to ensure only local transport operators beneated from the business.

NMC wants more distribution centres

DETERMINED to fulfil their national responsibility of ensuring maize remained available in the country at all times, the National Maize Cooperation is looking for more distribution

The government company, a category A parastatal, has embarked 1050n a nation-wide drive to collect enises 500,000 gnimaize and other available grains in

the country safe storage at their Matsapha depot as part of their mandate to ensure the nation was food secure.

CEO Dumsani Msibi told parliamentarians the company was not profit driven but paramount to them was to promote local production of the Swazi stable food and when needed, they source the grains outside the country to reduce the grain deficit.

Msibi said with the distribution centres spread across the country, their intention was to ensure farm-

ers enjoyed readily available markets for their products at their doorsteps. He said this helped reduce transportation costs and improved the farmers' profit mar-

The distribution centres themselves, opened valuable business opportunities to Swazis in that the NMC, according to Msibi, was not in the habit of setting up its own structures in the various communities where they had opened depots. Instead, a business opportunity was availed to the residents to lease their own structures and get to enjoy the rental fees plus commission on goods sold, all paid for by the NMC.

The distribution centres also served as selling points for maize consumers. Despite the NMC incurring costs for bringing the maize closer to the consumers, the company maintained the same price used at the Matsapha centre.

Is NMC a player and a referee?

THE notion that the NMC and NAMBoard played an unfair dual role in the agricultural industry was dismissed as without any basis.

NAMBoard CEO Siphephiso Dlamini told MPs under the agriculture portfolio that such a notion was not only untrue but an indication there was great need for the government parastatals and the legislators to seriously engage in talks on the operations and the role these national entities play in the

"The question of NMC being a player and a referee is not relevant here," said Dlamini. He said the legislators must understand these entities had spent millions of emalangeni into the industry, directly benefitting the producers and consumers alike.


"We ploughed back more than

E20 million into the industry directly to farmers while NMC ploughed more than E7million into the industry," argued Dlamini.

Dlamini said they and all this knowing very well the entities were established to senerate money in whatever form. He stated categorically grain prices were very high in the country, attributing that to various factors.

Dlamini said they were in the process of transforming the philosophy that exists amongst most farmers in the country that selling in small quantities was profitable.

Dlamini said, in account fact, farmers made huge losses when selling in small volumes at the country's market places as opposed to selling the whole production to NMC or NAMBoard on the sarm and save on transportation and other related



ESCAPE OF 7 INMATES RAISES EYEBROWS AT CORRECTIONAL

THE incident, which saw seven inmates escape from Big Bend Correctional facility between the night of Friday and Saturday morning, has since raised eyebrows amongst the authorities of the insti-

His Majesty's Correctional Services Public Relations Officer Bongani Khumalo said the institution was doing its best to uncover what had happened leading to the escape of the inmates who have been described as dangerous. Further investigations have, however, revealed that the inmates actually escaped on Friday evening, before 11pm.

The escape of the inmates was also communicated amongst the officers through a WhatsApp group about an hour after it occurred. Khumalo was later quoted as having stated that the possibility was the inmates cut off the burglar proofing bars to gain their way out of the remand cell.

The inmates were reportedly awaiting separate trials on charges varying from attempted murder, rape, robbery and house breaking and theft. It remains a mystery on how the suspects managed to outsmart the fully armed officers who are usually in the company of sniffer dogs, especially on night shifts. This are some of the things which have

raised questions amongst the authorities of the facility as an inside job is suspected.

Meanwhile, when Khumalo was asked on the frequency of such incidents, he stated the institution has not seen a similar incident at least for two decades now.

The last similar incident occurred at Nhlangano correctional facility in the late 80s, where a number of inmates escaped. This was a day before a pass-out parade for new recruits.

Khumalo said investigations were currently underway to ascertain how the suspects managed to get out. He stated that, however, this was not to suggest some officers could have assisted the suspects to gain their way out. Other references reflect that the incident of seven inmates escaping from Big Bend correctional facility is the third one taking place this year.

The first incident occurred in February, where an inmate ran away from the custody of officers while working at the institution's new site at Lukhula. The inmate further assaulted an officer with a bottle while attempting to apprehend him. He was eventually re-arrested two days later. The second incident occurred between May and June, where another inmate sneaked out of the facility after he was given manual work to do within the facility. His disappearance was noted a few minutes after he had left. He was also re-arrested about a week later.

... Stay vigilant, businesspeople warned

PEOPLE who operate businesses which handle money on a daily basis are warned to be more vigilant while the seven dangerous inmates remain on the loose.

HMCS Public Relations Officer Bongani Khumalo has also asked members of the public to be on the lookout for the suspects who broke out of Big Bend correctional facility on Friday evening. The suspects who have been identified as Banele Dlamini, Mancoba Sibandze, Siphamandla

Dlamini, Wandile Sigwane, Mpendulo Dlamini and Benson Shabalala have been described as dangerous, and were awaiting serious crimes including attempted murder, robbery and house breaking and theft when they escaped.

Umphakatsi to assist 'run-away' community cop

MAGWANYANA Indvuna Mkrestu Gamedze, has said the umphakatsi was fully behind the community police who left his homestead early this month after being threatened by residents.

Muzi Maziya is reported to have vacated his homestead and went to stay at an undisclosed place after receiving death threats from some residents. Maziya, who has been a community policeman in the area for many years, is allegedly wanted dead by some residents who are against his idea of following a rape case which involves a son to an indvuna from another community.

Speaking during an inter-

view, Gamedze said the umphakatsi has since been informed about the threats issued against Maziya. He also confirmed knowledge of the matter which was being investigated by the community policeman which eventually saw him being wanted dead by sympathisers of the sus-

pect. Gamedze said they had already informed the police about the disappearance of Maziya from the area after being threatened with violence. He said the umphakatsi was also aware of the suspect's identity who was being investigated by Maziya. Violence

He said the suspect was one of the gang members who made several night visits at his home and further threatened him with violence.

"We have since asked for the assistance of the police to help in bringing Maziya back to his home and provide him security," said Gamedze.

They would also summon the implicated people in Maziya's attack to warn them about their behaviour. He said the umphakatsi condemned the act of residents attacking community police for doing their job.

I heard voices, man tells court of hacking incident

Mbabane

A mentally-unstable boy who hacked a woman with a spade told the court voices in his head pushed him to commit the crime.

The shocking incident saw the boy attack his half-sister with a knobkerrie and hit her on the head the first day before using a spade to severely assault another woman. Thabo Makhubu told the court he heard voices that angered him thus assaulting the two.

He insisted in court he was mentally-unstable when he committed these horrific crimes which landed the two in hospital beds. These incidents happened on May 6 and 7 respectively, resulted in the 22-year-old man being charged with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

Makhubu was then rounded up by the police on May 11 and has been kept in custody since then after failing to raise the E500 bail the court afforded him.

When making his appear-

By Phesheya Kunene and ance in court during his trial, he was sentenced by Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati to pay a fine of E3 000 or spend two years in jail for each count.

However, Vilakati ruled that the counts would run concurrently. Coming to the matter, it is alleged Makhubu attacked one Nelisiwe Gamedze by hitting her with a knobkerrie three times on her head with intent to cause her grievous bodily harm. Terrified

While leading evidence in court, the visibly terrified Gamedze told the court her brother asked about the whereabouts of her other sister before attacking her out of the blue.

"He came rushing and found me cleaning the house; he only asked one question before assaulting me. I called the police after he left but they took forever so I then called the 977 toll free line," Gamedze said.

She said her wounds were stitched up in hospital. The unfortunate victim was Lindiwe Shongwe from Mdzangwini whom the sus-

pect assaulted on May 7. It is alleged he hacked her with a spade on her head and hands. Shongwe told the court she was saved by a dog

that came barking. Suddenly

"I had hired him to clear a portion of land for me, and he came to the door of my house to ask a question and suddenly he turned violent and hit me several times with the spade until he was disturbed by the dog," Shongwe

She further told the court she quickly called her husband who in turn notified her father-in-law who swiftly came to her rescue and took her to hospital and reported the matter to the police.

Makhubu said he was now feeling much better hence he was sorry for his actions. On the other hand, Vilakati insisted that he should continue using his medication.

"Your Worship, during the time I assaulted the two, I had not taken my medication as it was finished, so I think that contributed to my actions as I am mentally-disturbed," Makhubu said.





WOMAN WEEPS AS BABY DADDY GETS 2 YEARS IN JAIL

A court session had to stop for a moment yesterday when a woman burst into tears from a packed public gallery shortly after her baby daddy was sentenced to two years in jail or a fine of E2 000 for preventing police officers from doing their work at the Mbabane bus rank.

Mthunzi Fakudze blocked police officers from arresting his friend Sipho Nhleko after he was found drinking a 660ml Sibebe alcoholic drink at the Mbabane bus rank.

It is said while trying to be a hero to his friend, Fakudze gave his best shot as he tried to save Sipho Nhleko from being arrested. The two police officers, who

included Constable Salebona Jete, Bis Kenneth Matsebula, who was were arresting Nhleko for public indecency while drinking in pub-

Fakudze apologised for his actions, however, Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi sentenced him to two years in jail with an option of a E2 000 fine.

Moreover, his friend on the other hand was sentenced to pay a fine of E100 or face the prospect of spending six months in jail for drinking alcohol in public.

It was during the appearance of Fakudze's friend that his girlfriend broke down into tears as she wondered where she would get the money needed to see her man gaining his freedom again.

This incident followed another one whereby a dozing offender caused a commotion when officers tried to wake him up after his name was called up inside court.

when police woke him up while still looking awfully sleepy.

Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi was forced to postpone his matter to today after making it known that the suspect was far

from looking fit to appear before court. "Take him back into custody, his matter will proceed tomorrow," she said.

On another note, two men found themselves having to fork out E50 each after their cellphones disturbed the court at almost the same time. These incidents played themselves out yesterday morning when traffic related cases and others were heard in court.

First in the accused box was Sipho Nyamane who was sentenced to pay a fine of E2 400 after being found guilty of two traffic offences.

He was fined E1 600 for driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol and was further fined E800 for being found to have broken a traffic law while drunk. However, he was ordered to effectively pay E1 600 after the court ruled that his sentences would run concurrently.

DD offender pleads to pay month end

BONGANI Dukuza alleged that had it not been for his ailing father, he would have stayed away from driving as his mind was already made up that he would be enjoying drinks at home on Saturday night.

However, a call from his mother informing him about his sick father changed everything as Dukuza alleged that he did not think twice but jumped into his BMW sedan and rushed to pick his father and proceeded in rushing him to hospital. Dukuza was nabbed while driving on the MR19 Public Road at Hilltop in the early hours of Sunday morning. "As I was already drinking with my friends, I had no choice but to drive while drunk as they flooded me with calls. I also plead with the court to not only be lenient when passing sentence but to also consider allowing me to pay the fine once I have received my salary as I am broke now," he said.

The first offender pleaded guilty to the

offence and was convicted and found guilty as per his own plea. Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi sentenced him to a fine of E2 000 or two years in jail after his breath test recorded 1.28mg/l amount of alcohol in his body

Moreover, yet another first offender pleaded with the court to be lenient with him after he was found driving a motor vehicle while intoxicated. Otto Barros was sentenced to a fine of E1 000 or 10 months in jail after his breathalyser test recordings stood at 0.47mg/l.

I was test-driving car - Mechanic

A Mozambican national from Msunduza, Sergio Cossa told the court that being a foreigner was not easy to find a paying job in the country.

He highlighted this when pleading with the court to be lenient with him as he had no source of

income. "I stay with a woman and have two children; we are both unemployed so I beg the court to consider that. I rely on odd jobs and when I got arrested I was only test driving the car," Cossa said.

Cossa was arrested at Msunduza

after being found driving a Toyota hilux while under the influence of alcohol.

For these actions, the lawbreaker, who is also a first offender. saw the court giving him a fine of E1 500 or 15 months in jail.

PINEAPPLES AT MIDNIGHT ARRESTED

A man of Malkerns has been arrested after he was caught stealing pineapples in a field during the middle of the night.

The neighbours revealed that they were concerned because they had fallen victim to a person who was stealing their cabbages. However, they noted that the accused person was not stealing from their fields but was raiding those with pineapples.

The witness stated that he was also informed that a man was seen loading pineapples to his vehicle. Samkeliso said he

called his colleagues and they went to investigate. Upon arrival at the scene Sizwe was caught inside the car which had about 132 pineapples worth E6 600 loaded in the car. When asked what he was doing with the pineapples Samkeliso stated that he was hired by one Siboniso Malinga to transport the pineapples. He even stated that he could help the police. The accused appeared for trial yesterday before Magistrate Sebenzile Ndlela Kunene.

Dagga dealers in shoot-out with soldiers at Mshololo

DAGGA dealers have taken their smuggling mission to another level as they now carry heavy weapons with them when making their illegal crossing through the country's borders.

Soldiers stationed at Mshololo border fence got more than they had bargained for when trying to apprehend dagga dealers who were smuggling the banned substance to South Africa.

Information gathered is that the soldiers came under heavy fire when they tried to approach the dealers. It is said the Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF) members retaliated with an exchange of fire which then saw the dealers fleeing the

scene, leaving dagga weighing 12kg with a street value of E8 400. Army Public Relations Officer Wilfred Dlamini confirmed the incident, saying soldiers were involved in a shootout with dagga smugglers who were able to escape.

Dlamini added that no one was injured or killed during the incident.

The army PRO stated that the seized dagga was handed to Nhlangano police.

Meanwhile, in Pigg's Peak soldiers seized dagga weighing 34kg with a street value of E23 300 at an area known as Ka-Joel. The dagga was found together with a goat which was also being smuggled into South Africa.

Worth noting is that this pub-

MAN SEES NEIGHBOUR KISSING WIFE, LOSES IT

MUZI Ntjangase lost his cool when he allegedly saw his wife being kissed by a neighbour after dropping her off at their

Apparently, Ntjangase came back earlier than expected after he had told his wife that he was going to a funeral and would come back the next day.

However, the troubled man said after coming back early from the funeral, he found his children locked inside the house alone with their mother gone. With the aim of founding out what was going on, it is said Ntjangase then 'camped' inside his friend's car not far from their gate.

"I had returned way too early, and when I noticed that she was not at home I decided to lie in wiait inside the car. As I was waiting, a car driven by a man from the same area emerged and my wife stepped out. They kissed before the man drove off," Ntjangase alleged.

'Don't beat up cheating wife'

PRINCIPAL Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi gave angry husband Muzi Ntjangase counselling despite having sentenced him to five years in jail or a E5 000 fine.

Ntjangase was found guilty of assaulting his wife Zanele Makhubu, whom he accused of cheating. After having sentenced the accused, Nhlabatsi gave him a brief counselling session. She told Ntjangase that assaulting his wife because of cheating was not worth it. She further discouraged him from confronting his rival, saying that would be suicidal.

She said all this while encouraging him to be strong and use the right channels to deal with this matter. "You

He said his wife was not aware he was back and as she walked towards their house situated at Mvakwelitje, he also surfaced

will do something you will regret tomorrow if you act out of anger. The court is suspending your sentence on purpose. You have to learn to control your emotions, you need to be a man," she said.

She further told the first offender that he had two options, that of involving both their families to try and bring sense to her or just leave her for good.

"You will kill her if you keep on beating her and your children will blame you for killing their mother and you do not want that in your life. Moreover, the suspended years are a challenge you need to overcome, go back home and talk to your wife," she said.

from the car and approached her. "I was angry and grabbed a bush-knife I had found inside the car. I needed to know what was

going on and I wanted to take her to the man to get answers from him too, as he is also from the same area," he added.

The angry man assaulted his wife with fists on her face several times before hurting her with the bush-knife while his wife tried holding on to it to avoid being hacked with it.

She was injured on both her hands. Ntjangase was slapped with the offence of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm. After pleading guilty to the offence, the court convicted him and found him guilty as per his own plea.

He was sentenced to pay a fine of E5 000 or five years in jail. However, Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi suspended four years or E4 000 of the fine for three years.

However, the wife (Zanele Makhubu) denied everything and alleged that she was picked up by her male friends with an intention of attending a party but the plan was aborted due to the surfacing of her husband.

"I did not know he was hiding somewhere, but that does not change anything as he is lying about me. I did not kiss anyone on that day; I was going to a party. My husband and I have problems and it has been years since we have not been in good terms," she said.

Vinegar, sugar solution saved my cattle - farmer

IN the height of cattle dying in the country due to the alleged deadly hay, some farmers say their saving grace was a concoction of vinegar and sugar.

Elmon 'Nkabitiyaphekulwa' Nkambule, a farmer from Pigg's Peak said the vinegar and sugar solution saved 11 of his cattle.

Nkambule said he learnt of the lifesaving trick of the concoction from the past weekend's Observer on Saturday, in an article about the death of 60 cattle at Mpisi government farm.

He said before he learnt of the tip under the instruction of the Ministry of Agriculture's Director of Veterinary and Livestock Services Dr Xolani Dlamini from the newspaper, he had already lost a total of nine cattle from the deadly hay. Sickness

He said about 20 of his cattle were showing signs of the sickness.

The nine cattle died before I could administer the concoction on them. Some of the cattle that have drank the solution have fully recovered while three are still recovering. I mix 350 ml vinegar with 40 teaspoons of sugar in a five-litre bottle and allow it to dissolve then feed it to the cattle. The article stated that the cow should at least drink two litres of the five litres," he said.

FAMILY LOSES CAR IN DAGGA DEAL

A young man lost his mother's car in a dagga deal that went sour.

A Dlamini family from All Saints location, Mbabane, saw their son Mxondisi Dlamini pulling an unexpected stunt after he disappeared with a GWM van for days after he had initially told his mother that he was coming back home.

The 26-year-old man (Mxondisi) took the van to Nhlangano where upon arrival; he approached a mechanic and persistently requested him to exchange the van with his BMW sedan better known as 'gusheshe'.

After concluding the 'deal', it is said Dlamini then took the BMW and went to Nkwene where he gave it away for a few bags of dagga.

His overwrought mother, Nelisiwe Dlamini told Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi that her son took the motor vehicle's blue book and car keys of her other car when he disappeared on August 11.

She alleged that she kept calling her son but her attempts hit a snag.



Until about two months later whereby she decided to report the matter with the police in Mbabane.

However, she told the court that she recovered the car keys of the other car after her son's friends brought them back to her.

"Someone then tipped me and told me that they saw my son in Manzini, I then called my brother who caught him and surrendered him to the police.

Arrested

He was without the car and the blue book when he was arrested. He did not say anything to me and I did not bother asking him any questions as well," she said.

Furthermore, the crown brought in Sabelo Dladla, a witness who exchanged his BMW sedan for the stolen GWM van.

"After asking from my colleagues he then approached me and persistently asked me to exchange cars with him. I went to my father to ask for his permission, after Dlamini had convinced me that the car was his.

I had first told him to give me E25 000 for my car but then I got tempted and exchanged it and now I do not have a car as my car is not with him now after I was told he exchanged it for dagga at Nkwene," Dladla said.


Embarrassing

During mitigation, Dlamini apologised to both his parents and Dladla for embarrassing them with his actions.

"I am deeply sorry to my parents for embarrassing them like that. I also want to apologise to the guy for dragging his name into this. I ask the court to also forgive me for breaking the law," He said.

However, the principal magistrate told him that he would apply the Motor Vehicle Act whereby he would spend two years in jail without any option of a fine as he was a first offender.

Moreover, Constable Thulani Dlamini told the court that the BMW sedan was recovered at a certain Dlamini family at Nkwene but could not be driven away after it was discovered it had developed mechanical problems.



explained the importance of the exercise and its objectives.



COMESA **countries** urged to implement regional **Commitments**

THE 36th COMESA council of minister's meeting under the theme 'Inclusive and Sustainable Industrialisation' got underway in Antananarivo, Madagascar, with a call for enhanced industrialisation and an appeal to member states to implement regional commitments.

COMESA is the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa.

The core business of the meeting was to make decisions on the implementation of COMESA programmes, administrative and budget for the regional bloc for the next one year.

Ministers and their representatives from the 19 member states attended.

Prime Minister of Madagascar Olivier Mahafaly Solonandrasana, opened the meeting.

In his remarks, the PM appreciated COME-SA's work in the development of instruments and policies aimed at improving integration and boosting intra-COMESA trade.

However, he noted that the organisation continued to experience slow implementation and lack of domestication of various protocols by member states.

"The low level of transposition of regional instruments has negatively affected the implementation of the various programmes," he said. A recent survey undertaken by the Secretariat showed low levels of implementation of regional commitments at national levels and suggested sustained sensitisation and awareness campaigns of the COMESA protocols. The PM called on the Secretariat to increase awareness creation and build the confidence of the private sector by providing the necessary tools to exploit the opportunities within the region as this will be crucial especially that the private sector is the main driver of trade and investment. On that note, COMESA Secretary General Sindiso Ngwenya said intra-COMESA trade has grown to E260bn (\$20 billion) since the launch of the COMESA Free Trade Area in 2000. Despite the growth, it accounted for less than 10 percent of trade with the rest of the world. A study conducted by the Secretariat established that although intra COMESA Trade was low, there was a potential of trade worth \$82.3bn based on 2014 statistics.

"The paradox is these products are produced and exported to the rest of the world and at the same time imported from the rest of the world," Ngwenya said. The products included textiles, wooden furniture, horticulture, house hold items, confectioneries, hides and skins, foot wear and leather products, sugar confectioneries, tobacco and precious metals. During the meeting, the Minister for Trade and Consumption Armnad of Madagascar took over the chairmanship of the council from the outgoing Minister of State for Economic Development of Ethiopia, Ahmed Shide. Shide cited the greatest milestone of his tenure in office as the launching of the Tripartite Tree Trade Area in June, 2015 which provided the framework for the Continental Free Trade Area. He urged member states to hasten the pace on implementation of the agreement given that only 17 out of 26 tripartite countries had signed and none had so far ratified it.

I. Background

HIV transmission in Swaziland is high (19% among population 2 years and older and 26% among 15-49 years age group) (SDHS, 2006/07). According to the 2012 Swaziland HIV Incidence Measurement Survey (SHIMS), HIV incidence remains high (2.38%) in the Swaziland population with a peak among women in their late 30s and early 20s. This transmission occurs predominantly through heterosexual intercourse between infected and non-infected persons and condom use plays an important role in preventing such

Due to this high prevalence of HIV of the country, the use of condom is critical and a major part of the HIV prevention strategy for the country. Condoms are also known to be important for family planning and the prevention of other sexually transmitted infections (STIs); this holds true in Swaziland as well.

Although knowledge about condoms and that they protect one from HIV is very high in the country (94% amongst women and 92% amongst men), low and inconsistent levels of condom use has been cited as one on the drivers of the HIV epidemic in Swaziland. The use of condoms during sex, especially with non-regular partners has been proven to be important for reducing the spread of HIV. According to the Swaziland Demographic Health Survey (SDHS) 2006/7, condom use in the general population was estimated to be at 56% for females and 46% for men with every high risk sexual act. Approximately half of the sexually active respondents aged 15-49 years admitted to having non regular sex without a

In 2014, the Multiple Indicator Cluster Survey (MICS) showed that condom use at last sex among people with more than one sex partner was 82.6% for men and had dropped to 66% among women. Even though later statistics have shown that the use of condoms has risen especially among men from 2007, there is still however need to increase the demand and use of condoms in the country through as many innovative mechanisms as possible.In addition, according to the behavior sentinel surveillance (BSS 2011) preliminary results consistent condom use among youth aged 15-24 is 48.3% and still 20.7% have never used a condom. Less than a third of the people interviewed were already aware about their HIV status, although more than 70% declared to have not disclosed their positive status to anyone (BSS 2011) which shows the need for stronger condom programming

In addition to all this, the Swazi population is still faced with other various problems related to Sexual and Reproductive Health (SRH) which include early sexual debut, teenage pregnancies, sexual abuse, dropping out of school, and orphan-hood mainly due to the HIV/AIDS epidemic. With these high HIV statistics and low usage of condoms among the Swazi population especially the youth, there is therefore need for the country to have a clear and mapped out Condom Strategy to ensure the condom programming. It is against this background that the Ministry of Health through the support of UNFPA seek to engage a consultant to evaluate the 2010-2015 Condom Strategy and proposed a New Strategy

II. Overall Objective of the Consultancy

The main objective of the consultancy is to conduct an evaluation of the National Condom Strategy 2010-2015 and drafting a strategy proposal for a new strategy 2016-2020. The consultant will be expected to address the following broad research questions:

- (1) What is the extent to which the implementation of the strategy have been achieved?

MAN [80] FOUND DEAD BEHIND GOVT OFFICES

Stories by Starsky Mkhonta Nhlangano

MYSTERY surrounds the death of an old man who was a common feature within the Swaziland Tobacco Cooperative Company premises which houses some government offices and other departments.

Richard Shabangu estimated to be in his late 80s was found dead behind the government offices last Tuesday.

He used to assist in cleaning around the offices' premises but not as a fulltime employee as this was an arrangement between him and the owners of the premises because he had no one to take care of him.

It is still not clear as to what really killed Shabangu as earlier on, he was seen moving around doing his usual duties only for him to be found dead behind the building late in the afternoon towards 15:00 hours.

Those who made the grisly find, included tenants some being the mechanics who operate their business within the premises.

One mechanic who identified himself as Thomas, said he was going to fetch some of his tools somewhere when he stumbled on Shabangu's corpse. He said at first he thought the old man was just taking a nap but what worried him was that he was lying right in the pathway.

"I drew closer and I realised that he was dead as he was not breathing and his body remained motionless. I then raised an alarm," said Thomas.

Police were then alerted and they arrived and the corpse was taken to the Nhlangano Health Centre.

A doctor certified that he was indeed dead and was taken to a mortuary.

Director of Swaziland Tobacco Bernard 'Nkunz'kayihlehli' Nxumalo confirmed that Shabangu was found dead behind one of the buildings. He said he got a call while he was away in Piet Retief, South Africa where he was informed about the sad news.

"He was a part of us and would clean around the premises. Lately, he was not so well and not long time ago; a relative had taken him to Etjejuba (hospital in South Africa)

OLD MAN WANTED TO DIE

THE are allegations from those who had an encounter with Richard Shabangu that he kept saying he wanted to die.

"He kept telling us he was tired of living, Shabangu hinted that he was feeling some pain and as someone who was in and out of hospitals, he seemed to accept whatever was going to happen.

"He indicated to us that living to him was a misery. However, we never took him seriously and despite that we were aware he was not feeling well, we kept saying it could be old age that made him to say such things," one lady who knew him said. Others also said during the fateful day, he was seen walking slowly and aimlessly. "I talked to him just this morning and even though it was clear that he was not well, he talked sense. I was shocked when I saw people flocking to where he was found dead and later the arrival of police," said one of the mechanics who is based in the premises Shabangu cleaned.

He returned and looked better but not fully recovered. From what we heard is that he was having a heart problem and at times he would get swollen feet.

We are saddened by his loss as he was considered a part of us following that he seemed to have no relatives who could take care of him," said

Nxumalo. Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that an old man was found dead behind a building housing some government offices and departments.

"It's like a sudden death but we are still investigating," said Assistant Supt Vilakati.



Well the argument is they are trying to fix our justice. I hope this does not backfire. My point is such morning sickness highlights the state our judiciary is in-ICU.

Then there is the killer punch that was delivered by the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala last week that inevitable further infused life into former Minister Commerce Gideon Dlamini. For those who have forgotten, last Monday the ACC took to the High Court.

There, the ACC wanted to get a warrant to arrest Dlamini and two others for allegedly breaking the law. Justice Maphalala said not a chance.

He dismissed the application stating there was no evidence linking the minister with the said criminal activity.

Personally, I have no problem with the ruling but I have a problem with what it means to us. Firstly, to me the Monday ruling left me wondering why Justice Maphalala opted to pronounce it in open court. Who was he trying to get the message across to? Was it us the nation or someone specifically? I think both are correct.

Normally, applications of this nature are heard in the chief justice's chamber unless of course like it happened last week, the CJ decides to go public.

If I may ask, why was the warrant to arrest Lillian from ACC then was not made public like this case? Moving on from that aspect, Justice Maphalala went on to punch holes on the Anti Corruption law where he felt it breached certain fundamental constitutional rights.

Again, I had no problem with that as a justice consumer.

However, I had a problem with its timing. Justice Maphalala has been

around when people were raided and arrested without notification. Ask Marwick Khumalo he would write a novel on what he suffered at the hands of police from ACC.

Former Minister Sibusiso Shongwe would sing all night if asked to say how he was treated by ACC police where his home was raided and himself, arrested.

Worse still, Shongwe was arrested while serving as minister. His case was done quietly in the chambers. His constitutional rights were never considered. I won't say by who because they know themselves. I deliberately chose these two because they share the same status as Gideon.

What does the ruling by Justice Maphalala say to these incidents? Why has he been quiet all along as his courts breached constitutional rights?

Combining the public display he did on the Gideon case specifically and what he had to say, I smell a rat. Justice Maphalala should have rather provided solutions to the problems we seem to have as a country where

we arrested people in breach of laid down constitutional rights and their cases are still pending in court.

What does this mean? I should be asking this question from lawyers but they have suspended thinking because they want proper supreme court judges thus they can't think.

Again, Justice Maphalala should tell us what this means in the country's quest to arrest corruption?

He must have further explained if it would be ideal for a country to seek permission from a thief to raid and arrest him? I am not in anyway challenging the ruling but rather raising pertinent issues that I could not ignore.

In future I wonder if it could be considered that the CJ does not sit alone when deciding on whether someone can be arrested or not. Incidents of the past like the one in my opening line came to the fore after the ruling. But I dismissed them.

Somebody help me here, who should benefit from the luxury to be requested from the CJ to be raided and arrested?

Who are those citizens? Are we not supposed to be equal in the eyes of justice? There are so many people who have been arrested and later released after trial because of lack of evidence. What would have been different with Gideon?

Sibusiso Shongwe was arrested under the same arrangement. As it is, he is waiting to clear his name in court and who knows, he may be acquitted if found that evidence is lacking.

MANY of us might respond to this question with a resounding yes.

It is easy to think that we all got better rest in those halcyon days when summers were long and hot, winters were snowy and life was a bit less frenetic. But even if this is true about your own sleep, is it really true of people as a whole?

In UK, data that I was involved in collecting around a decade ago, a representative sample of adults by age, sex and geography said they slept for an average of seven hours and three minutes a day. This suggested that over half of the population slept between five hours 30 minutes and eight hours 35 minutes; and about three-quarters slept between five and nine and a half hours per night.

The problem with these general figures, just like the mythical eight hours a night, is that things get more complicated when we ask people how much they sleep on rest or work days, and what age they are.

People sleep longer on rest days than on work days by an average of about 20 minutes, and this is true of all age groups until retirement.

And although the graph does not show it, reported sleep duration also depends on gender. In middle age, for example, women report sleeping longer than men.

Comparisons

A small number of studies which have used similar methods over time show small increases or small decreases of a few minutes per night over several decades in different countries across the world. But there

is absolutely no good evidence that sleep durations are shortening dramatically in the UK or elsewhere.

A fascinating study from last year looked at the sleep patters of tribes-people in Tanzania, Namibia and Bolivia. It measured their actual sleep - as opposed to self-reports - and found they averaged between five hours 40 minutes and seven hours six minutes a night.

Lifestyles In other words, many of them seem to be sleeping less than those in the fast-paced 24-7 UK. This again suggests that modern lifestyles are depriving people of less sleep than you might

have expected. Incidentally, another study reported sleep data earlier this year from 8 000 users of an iPhone sleep app around the

world. It showed that the average length of a night's sleep was around seven hours 50 minutes.

The UK, Germany, Norway, Spain, the US and Mexico were all very close to this average. Australia, New Zealand, the Netherlands and France reported longer sleep, while Brazil and Japan were below average. Unfortunately, the numbers in age groups in different countries wasn't controlled.

Pinch

The data are therefore unlikely to be representative of the countries concerned or directly comparable with each other, and so need a large pinch of salt.

Catching up

From the information above, it might mean that our intuition is simply wrong about glorious night times past. Or maybe the real question is different:

whether we are sleeping less than we need. We know from laboratory studies in which people can have nearly unlimited sleep that they quickly satiate: that is, they reach a point where the amount they sleep stabilises.

This suggests that if we were getting enough sleep on weekdays, we would not sleep more on rest days.

For individuals, a large difference in sleep on rest days and work days is a useful indicator of unmet need for sleep. For the UK as a whole, the gap between work and rest days suggests that people maybe are sleeping less than they need - at least those of school or working age.

We don't know much about how this gap has changed over the years, though there are some fascinating data from South Korea taken from regular surveys between 1981 and 2005. Weekday sleep didn't change over the period, though Saturday sleep increased by 13 minutes and Sunday sleep by 24 minutes per night.

I suspect we would see something similar if we looked for the same phenomenon in other countries.

What is probably happening is that the rising demands of the working week are increasing the amount of sleep we need. If so, having less time available on weeknights might mean we can only meet this increased need for sleep on the weekend - if at all. Time with family, exercising and other demands on our lives outside work probably allow us all less scope than we would like.

So are we sleeping less? No. But we may be sleeping less well than we need to.

SNPF DISTRIBUTES E400M TO MEMBERS

THE Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) has paid out over E400 million to their members in the last 12 months.

General Manager Business
Development and Finance
Langalakhe Dlamini said it took
them four days to process the
payments for the year ended June
2016.

Dlamini was speaking during the Swaziland Retirement Funds Seminar held on Friday at the Royal Swazi Sun Convention Centre.

The event was themed, 'Offshore investing for the Swaziland Retirement Funds.'

He said their investment philosophy was based on a three legged philosophy which resonates from most of their members background.

Their major three pillars were, firstly the return in investment, secondly the economic development-how will that investment create decent employment not just employment and the third pillar was environmental, social and governance.

"We want an investment that

will give us a return at least inflation plus five, we start ticking. Then we look at economic development-are there any new jobs that will be created, if it is decent jobs we tick. Then we come to the environmental and social issues and governance," he said.

He said to them each of the pillars were equally important, "we take governance as paramount as we are going to first world status in 2022. This means our level of governance should match that level."

Dlamini said their assets, which were sitting in the country, would be 39 percent, offshore 61 percent, including South Africa.

He said they were split in listed equity, bond, cash, private equity, commodities and residential property. Dlamini said there was a need to exercise caution when going offshore, "the target should be let us balance what we are sitting with here against what you can get there, so you are now countering your risk."

With regards to liquidity, Dlamini said the economy (Swaziland and South Africa), where it just takes the president to make a statement and the rand crashes big time.

He said this was the case in the United States, however, since their economies were more stable, it does not react the way it reacts in the South African economy.

"It was just December 10, 2015 big monies were wiped off from pension funds just because there was a change of the minister of finance. When you step back and look who appointed the minister of finance it's the same president and then he fires his own guy and we end up being the ones battered," he said.

He was referring to the incident where South African President Jacob Zuma fired then Finance Minister Nhlanhla Nene, which triggered the rand's biggest decline in more than four years. "That then takes us to the level where we are saying we need to counterbalance that," he said.

INVESTORS SHUN GOVERNMENT'S 91 DAYS TREASURY BILL

INVESTORS shunned government's 91-Days Treasury Bill last week at the weekly auction of the government's short term debt.

According to the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS)
Government Treasury Bills announcement, the total amount on offer for the 91-DaysT-Bill was E100 million, however, the total allotted was only E13.4 million.

"Competitive bids allotted was for E5 million and non-competitive bids managed to raise just E8.4 million," reads the report in part.

Investors shunned the debt instrument even though it offered very competitive yield rates, the 91-Days T-Bill offered investors a yield of about 7.8 percent.

The 91-Days T-Bill would mature in January 13, 2017. The average discount rate during the last successful auction was 7.5percent.

The next auction for the 91-Days T-Bill would take place on



Wednesday where the maturity date and settlement date would be October 21, 2016 and January 20, 2017.

The 182-Days T-Bill, on the other hand was fully subscribed

as investors were interested in the 182-Days T-Bill.

"Competitive bids received were for E40 million and noncompetitive bids invested just E2.78 million," the report adds. The total amount raised during the auction is just above E53 million. Treasury Bills are shortterm marketable debt financial instruments issued by CBS on behalf of government on a weekly basis.

Competitive bids were submitted by institutional investors, with a minimum amount of E5million, in multiples of E1million.

Individuals submit bids on a non-competitive basis and take the weighted average discount for the competitive bids accepted during the auction.

The minimum amount for noncompetitive bidders was E10 000, thereafter in multiples of E10 000.

Treasury Bills were issued at a discount, that is, they were sold at a price less than their face (par) value.

The bids have to show the amount and discount rate expressed at an annual rate rounded to three decimal places.

When bidding, they are supposed to specify only the amount of the bid and not state the discount rate as they are price tak-

AFDB TO ASSIST COUNTRY DEVELOP CAPITAL MARKETS

THE African Development Bank (AfDB) has announced its commitment to assist government develop the country's capital market.

AfDB Acting Regional Director Kennedy Mbeakeni said the economic development of the country could greatly benefit from the development of its capital market.

"We are looking at various strategies that will involve possible partnerships of the bank with the government to deepen the Swaziland capital market," he said.

Mbeakeni said the AfDB had observed the large capital holdings of institutional investors such as retirement funds and insurance companies and their potential to contribute to economic development by investing more of their assets under management money in the domestic capital market space.

"It would seem the institutional investors are risk averse as they prefer to invest in the more advanced and sophisticated South African capital market," he said.

Mbeakeni said in the next year, the bank would step up efforts in developing the capital market by implementing certain strategies. "Securitisation of financial instruments could be implemented in the development of the capital market of the country," he said. These sentiments on the relationship between capital market development and economic growth were recently shared by the Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini.

"The country needs a broad and flourishing capital market to meet the additional demand for local investment and therefore spur economic growth," he said. Dlamini was speaking during the recently held Capital Markets Indaba hosted by the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) at the Royal Villas, Ezulwini.

Dlamini said the capital market indaba enabled all the stakeholders to acknowledge the importance of capital markets in the development of an economy, thus enabling the savings of individuals and institutions to be used by businesses and governments. "Creating the growth in capital markets to meet the additional demand for local investment is the immediate challenge, the Swaziland Stock Exchange(SSX) and FSRA leading other stakeholders to produce proposals, assisted by the computerisation of the SSX for greater speed and protection," he said.

"I would also like to take this opportunity to urge the government to take the lead in the development of the local capital market. This will likely spur the private sector to also follow suit in participating in the local capital market," he said.

LOAD SHEDDING A THING OF THE PAST, BUT...

JOHANNESBURG - The trauma of load shedding is a thing of the past, Eskom's Group Executive for Generation, Matshela Koko, assured Parliament this week, but the risk will return by 2026 if the country fails to make a decision now on whether or not to build new nuclear power stations.

An updated Integrated Resource Plan (IRP) has been promised before the end of the year, and Energy Minister Tina Joemat-Pettersson said it was ready to be presented to the cabinet, but a meeting of the cabinet subcommittee scheduled for this week had been postponed.

That plan - the first official energy planning blueprint since 2010 - will finally take place before the public the assumptions about economic growth and consequent demand for electricity, and the government's thinking on whether to go for nuclear.

But Koko revealed Eskom's expectations, saying its business plan anticipated peak demand to reach 40GW by 2026, compared with the 35GW peak demand it met this winter. In other words, Eskom sees growth in peak demand of 5GW over the next 10 years, giving rise, in Koko's view, to the need for an urgent decision on nuclear.

But Energy commentator Chris Yelland said no one could confidently predict future electricity demand because the economy was undergoing a profound structural change affecting energy intensity.

Since the global financial crisis of 2008, demand for electricity has been falling. Yelland said this was partly because primary industries such as smelting and deep-level gold mining were scaled back in the face of the slump in demand for commodities. Sunday Independent

EXCESSIVE RED TAPE SHOVES FUND MANAGERS OFFSHORE

WITH the proposed 50 percent local investment requirement for fund managers, government through the regulator, will have to ease red tape challenges.

Red tape could be defined as excessive regulation or rigid conformity to formal rules which are normally considered redundant.

Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) General Manager Business Development and Finance Langalakhe Dlamini said excessive red tape meant it was difficult to get any one asset of the ground, "It will take you a lifetime, just in red tape that is getting the license and authority to do the next thing."

Dlamini was speaking during the Swaziland Retirement Funds breakfast seminar held last Friday at the Royal Swazi Sun Convention Centre.

He said this worked against the recommendation to invest locally which they understand remains critical since that was where they get their 'bread and butter.'

Dlamini said they once tried to list the SNPF properties, bound them together and created a property unit trust, worked so hard spending sleepless nights trying to understand what they were doing, prepared all the necessary documentation, but when they were ready, they got a letter that Cabinet has rejected their move, "So that was the end of it."

He said that was after they consulted with almost all the relevant stakeholders and everybody was happy about the instrument.

"So that red tape is extremely frustrating, we seem not to know enough of where we are going such that it is almost by chance to strike gold it's not strategic gold that is where the frustration comes in. So what do we do? We go offshore," he said.

He said even turning to the South African market could not be considered as geographic diversification.

"Sitting in Swaziland you are as good as being in South Africa, you cannot then say your eggs are not in one basket if they are sitting just next door.

If South Africa gets downgraded is a simple fact the Swaziland will be downgraded too. We interlink, we are pegged on the rand, and we don't make decisions independent of South Africa.

So looking for something different, there is temptation to visit the offshore market," Dlamini further noted.

Commenting on the issue of red tape, Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) Chief Executive Officer (CEO)
Sandile Dlamini, said when pushing developments in the country it was critical to identify who were the people who could decide on that development's favour.

"For instance, us as the regulator we report to the minister of finance, who reports to Cabinet and the Cabinet is chaired by the prime minister. We have always discovered that apart from writing an ordinary letter to the minister, it always works if we then go and have audience with the minister and explain to him what we are trying to achieve.

If we think the minister understands enough, we then say minister before the next Cabinet meeting can you accompany us so that we can go and explain this to your chairman or the prime minister? because if the two principals understand and appreciate what we are trying to achieve, we have always found that in most cases we succeed," said Dlamini.

Referring more closely to the SNPF frustration, Dlamini said the situation has improved drastically.

He said the regulator has been making a lot of noise to government and the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) to revamp and change completely the issue of government bonds and instruments.

"We are saying government should be always in the market looking for money. But, we are all aware that what has been happening up to now, government only raises a paper or issues a bond when it has already been announced in the newspapers that maybe next month there is going to be a problem in paying civil servants salaries," he said.

Dlamini said the timing of the instruments was critically important, "We knew that the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) revenue is going down, why then didn't we do stock piling and aimed at creating a large pool of reserves?"

He said that could have cushioned and have given the country confidence, especially because signs were there it was struggling.

Dlamini said there was room for debt expansion since the country's debt stood at only 17 percent, while South Africa stood at 48 percent, yet the benchmark is around 25 percent, "So there a number of things we can do. I want to encourage SNPF to touch base with the regulator."

He said when the they present to Cabinet, they tell them what they need to know, not what they were expecting to be told by the regulator.

THE Financial Services

All along, the funds could hold
about 50 percent of the total assets
as cash.

Following Cabinet's push for the increase of the local investment of insurance and pension funds from 30 to 50 percent, FSRA Chief Executive Officer Sandile Dlamini said all what they were trying to do as a regulator was to find the best way how this could be achieved. Therefore, he said the changes would come with a revision of the investment schedule, including reducing the amount of cash held by funds.

He said this would enable them to be innovative in where they would invest the money.

"We don't need that money to be flooding the banking industry; that money should be productively invested elsewhere in the economy to develop the country.

Even when you go offshore, we don't want you to be parking this money with some foreign based financial institutions," he said.

Govt should take advantage of regional integration

GORVENMENT should take advantage of the regional integration initiatives available so it can diversify its sources of revenue.

"The regional integration initiative of the country is at the core of any diversification strategy the country comes up with," said African Development Bank (AfDB) Acting Regional Director Kennedy Mbeakeni.

"With the different regional integration agreements, the country has access to almost 70 percent of the population of the continent. This provides ample markets for the country to penetrate in a bid to diversify its source of revenues," he said.

Swaziland is a member of a number of regional integration blocs such as Southern African Customs Union, Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA).

"The government should formulate various strategies how this vast market may be leveraged for Swaziland's economic growth," he said.

He said by positioning them this way the country could attract foreign direct investment which would provide the capital to drive the penetration of the country on the Africa continent.

"The revenues sourced from SACU receipts have been proven to be volatile and therefore other sources of revenue need to be identified. The AfDB will aid the country identify these sources," he said.

Southern African Customs Union (SACU) revenue to fall markedly in the medium term.

The IMF said with imports having declined in 2015 and low growth expected going forward, combined with the lags built in the SACU revenue formula, this vital source of revenue will decline markedly.

According to the Article IV
Consultation report, 2016, the IMF
said the slowdown of the South
African economy will affect other
countries within SACU which rely
heavily on South Africa in their
shared customs receipts, as

South Africa accounts for about 85 percent of total SACU imports. Adding, IMF said the spill over effects would affect the

whole continent in general and Southern African part in particular.

The IMF noted in its Article IV Consultation

with Swaziland recommended that government should explore domestic revenue measures.

"Exploring additional measures such as ensuring dividend payments by profit making public enterprises would enhance revenue for the country," reads the report in part. Locally, the Central Bank of Swaziland also expressed its wish for the government to diversify its sources of revenue. In its 2015/2016 Annual Report it made some recommendations in this regard.

"Swaziland has a potential to attract fresh foreign direct investment (FDI) into the mining sector considering her rich and diversified mineral deposit.

It is welcomed development that government is currently working towards increasing the contribution of the mining sector to gross domestic product from the current level of 0.07 per cent to over 4 per cent by 2018," the CBS said.

The bank said the country's efforts to establish a thermal power plant presents another excellent opportunity for FDI attraction into Swaziland.

"There is a need to accelerate the construction of the thermal power considering the shortage of power in the country and the region which is a bottleneck to the productivity of other sectors of the economy," the CBS said.

SARB's Kganyago raised red flag on Gupta bank probe

CAPE TOWN – Lesetja O Kganyago, South African
Reserve Bank (SARB) governor,
raised his concerns about possible political interference in the
operations of banks as early as
April this year.

In a letter that formed part of an affidavit submitted to the North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria last Friday by the Finance Minister, Pravin Gordhan, Kganyago reacted to a Cabinet resolution in April that certain Ministers engage with banks who had terminated their relationship with the Gupta family.

"We caution against the unintended consequence of this being viewed as undue political interference in banks' operations, and restricting the ability of banks to make independent operational decisions within the parameters of the existing legal and regulatory

frameworks," Kganyago wrote.
"This could introduce heightened levels of uncertainty and pose a risk to South Africa's financial stability," he continued.

Kganyago's letter to Gordhan

was dated April 26 – five days after Jeff Radebe, Minister for Planning, Monitoring and Evaluation, told journalists in a media briefing that three cabinet ministers were to hold meetings with South Africa's four big banks to find out why they closed the bank accounts of the Gupta-owned Oakbay Investments.

At the time, Radebe said the three ministers tasked with the deliberations would be Mosebenzi Zwane, Minister of Mineral Resources who has ties with the Gupta family, as well as Labour Minister Mildred Oliphant and Gordhan.

Although Gordhan was never part of these meetings, he sought legal advice from senior counsel Jeremy Gauntlett who said Gordhan wasn't empowered to intervene in the matter.

Last Friday, Gordhan went a step further and asked the Pretoria High Court to declare that he is not legally empowered to intervene in the relationship between the Guptas and the four big banks, Absa, First National Bank, Standard Bank of SA and Nedbank.

In his court papers it is revealed that 72 suspicious transactions, totalling R6.83bn, took place, that were all related to the Guptas, or companies controlled by the family.

DA spokesperson on finance, David Maynier, said it is interesting to note that of the 72 suspicious transactions, 26 of them in the amount of R5.99bn, took place after Mr Nazeem Howa, the chief executive officer of Oakbay Investments, lodged his first complaint to Gordhan, claiming "corporate bullying" and "anti-competitive practices".

HOW MEDICAL AIDS MILK YOU

JOHANNESBURG - Trustees of medical schemes are making a killing out of member contributions.

Last year, schemes paid millions of rands to trustees, who are supposed to be volunteering their services.

Some schemes even paid more than R500 000 to each trustee.

Topping the list was Discovery Health Medical Scheme, which paid R673 000, on average, to each of its six trustees.

The beleaguered Government Employees Medical Scheme (Gems) followed closely behind by paying 12 trustees R597 000 each last year.

Also on the list of big spenders was Medshield Medical Aid Scheme, which paid each of its trustees an estimated R544 000.

Bonitas Medical Fund paid about R352 000 and Fedhealth Medical Aid about R314 000 to each of their trustees.

Tebogo Maziya, general manager for financial supervision at the Council for Medical Schemes, said trustees' remuneration was of concern and that the council was working to change the scenario.

"Two years ago, the council undertook research work – together with tax and advisory firm EY – where we unpacked trustee remuneration," she said.

"One of the recommendations emanating from the research was that we should consider reviewing regulation 6 [of the Medical Schemes Act]."

She also suggested that the review should empower the registrar to determine the appropriate remuneration for trustees. fin24

Steinhoff to buy Australia's Fantastic for \$275m

JOHANNESBURG - Steinhoff International Holdings NV agreed to buy Fantastic Holdings Ltd. of Australia for A\$361.4m (\$275m) as the South African retailer seeks to expand its footprint in the southern hemisphere.

The company offered A\$3.50 a share in cash, a 43% premium to Thursday's closing share price, Fantastic Holdings said in a state-

ment last Friday. The deal was backed by directors of the Sydney-based furniture company and investors controlling more than 50 percent of the stock also supported the proposal.

"The addition of Fantastic Holdings, its brands and manufacturing operations, will broaden our brand portfolio and accelerate the growth of Steinhoff Asia Pacific in Australasia," Tim Schaafsma, a director of
Steinhoff Asia Pacific, said in the
statement. The deal is Steinhoff's
first since raising €2.45bn
(\$2.69bn) last month in a share
sale to investors including
Christo Wiese, South Africa's
richest man. The company has
also bought UK discount chain
Poundland Group Plc and
Mattress Firm Holding Corp. of
the US in the past year as it aims

to challenge the likes of Ikea. Shares in Steinhoff, listed in Frankfurt and Johannesburg as

Frankfurt and Johannesburg and headquartered in Amsterdam, rose 3.1% to €4.79 in the German city on Friday, the biggest gain since September 28. That values the company at €20bn.

The acquisition of Fantastic adds 125 Australian stores to Steinhoff's existing 157 in the country, investment company Exane said in a note to clients. *fin24*



AU adopts charter on piracy and illegal fishing

LOME - The African Union (AU) adopted an agreement on piracy, illegal fishing and maritime security at a summit in Togo on Saturday.

"We are happy to announce the adoption and signing of a charter on maritime security, safety and development in Africa," Congolese President Denis Sassou Nguesso said, hailing a "historic" decision that would boost economic and social development.

Nguesso said 43 of the AU's 54 members — 38 of which have a coastline — adopted the summit text, which is binding. It commits signatories to environmental protection and action against maritime crime as well as trafficking in drugs, arms and people. The countries commited to creating national and regional institutions "to promote maritime security".

Togo's Foreign Minister, Robert Dussey, told AFP ahead of the meeting that there was a clear need to join forces on policy, indicating the stakes were "very high" amid an upsurge of piracy in recent years, spreading from the Gulf of Aden, off Somalia, to the Gulf of Guinea, which is now a hotspot for piracy. Dussey said maritime security was paramount for African development, not just given the threat from piracy and illegal fishing depleting a key resource but the threat from environmental degradation.

Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta, whose country has suffered from insecurity in the Gulf of Aden, praised the outcome of the meeting as a display of Africa's ability to put together a continent-wide strategy. AFP

Gunmen kill 11 in CAR camp - UN

BANGUI, CAR - Eleven people were shot dead on Saturday in a camp for displaced people in Central African Republic, the UN's MINUSCA mission said, days after 30 others were killed in fresh sectarian violence.

"Eleven people were killed and about 10 others taken to hospital after an unknown number of gunmen began shooting in the camp for internally displaced people in Ngakobo, 300 kilometres (180 miles) northeast of the capital Bangui," a statement said.

"Those responsible for these dreadful acts" have not been identified," the communique, in French, said. MINUSCA, which has around 12 000 peacekeepers and police on the ground, "immediately took measures to reinforce its position around the displaced camp and to step up its patrols," it said.

Last Wednesday, 30 people died and 57 others were wounded when fighters from a mainly-Muslim militia group attacked civilians and clashed with UN peacekeepers in the central town of Kaga Bandoro.

The fighters then attacked a camp for displaced people as well as NGO offices. UN troops from Burundi and Pakistan hit back to protect civilians, killing 12 of the assailants.

The week before a dozen people died in the capital in fighting between Muslim forces and Christian vigilantes

CAR plunged into chaos after the March 2013 ousting of long-serving president Francois Bozize, a Christian, by the mainly Muslim Seleka rebel alliance — triggering revenge attacks and a spiral of atrocities in which thousands were slaughtered.



Aisha claimed her husband did not know many top gov-




BELONGS TO THE KITCHEN: Nigerian President Mohammadu Buhari with his wife Aisha.

Gupta revelations: Damning information submitted in court

JOHANNESBURG - The latest development in the saga involving the Gupta family and local banks could shed more light on what exactly transpired.

In an affidavit, Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan says transactions of R6.8-billion may have contributed to banks closing accounts belonging to the Guptas.

His affidavit was included in papers filed in the High Court in Pretoria on Friday. Gordhan approached the Financial Intelligence Centre for assistance with the filing.

Gordhan is asking the court for an order declaring that he can't interfere with the bank's decision.

According to the AmaBhungane Centre for Investigative Journalism, which broke the story, this could compel banks to divulge their reasons for blocking the Guptas.

"He's effectively challenging both the Guptas and the banks to come forward with the information," said AmaBhungane journal-

ist Susan Comrie in an interview with eNCA.

"On the one hand he's saying to the Guptas, 'You are entitled to tell the banks, they can disclose, they can break their client confidentiality and tell us the reasons why they decided to terminate the relationships. And if there were no good reasons then we'll see that.'

"On the other hand, he's saying to the banks, 'This is a forum whereby you are now entitled to disclose that information that you haven't been able to disclose before'," she said.

"So, we're not quite sure what the Guptas are going to do, we're not quite sure what the banks are going to do. There's a lengthy list of respondents who all have an opportunity now to kind of put evidence out there that could finally give us some answers," Comrie added.

Gordhan has been under pressure to intervene in the Gupta-banks matter. The suspicious payments, apparently made over four years, are listed in a Financial Intelligence Centre report that is attached to the court papers.

Gordhan has cited as respondents the banks, Gupta holding company Oakbay Investments and 13 associated companies.

The banks have refused, so far, to state publicly why they've cut ties

with the Guptas.

eNCA specialist reporter Karyn Maughan believes the timing of the release of the Gordhan affidavit is linked to the Public Protector's report on state capture.

"It very much appears that the information that Pravin Gordhan is disclosing in this affidavit is what Treasury told Thuli Madonsela as part of that probe, because she would have been investigating why the banks severed ties and why was there this bizarre statement."

"And, I think on the day that she agrees she's not going to release the report, we see the minister filing this quite extraordinary application where he wants an order saying, 'I should not be expected to intervene in this row because there's a huge amount of questionable stuff going on here and I can't be asked to get involved in this.""

"The timing is very obviously part of this broader political dynamic and crisis," Maughan added.

Junction Residence Complex.

"He was in his room. They [police] came and surrounded him."

The Wits SRC said on its Facebook page that allegedly his room "was stormed by police". It added that he was apparently not told why he was being arrested.

According to the University, he was taken to the Cleveland Police Station.

Mpofu told News24 he had spent an hour with Dlamini at the station in the early hours of the morning and expected to consult with him later yesterday again.

He also tweeted that Dlamini was well.

De Beer said an update on when Dlamini might appear in court was to be available later yesterday.

COSATU demands R3.2 million from NUMSA

JOHANNESBURG - The National Union of Metalworkers of South Africa (NUMSA) says it has received a letter from attorneys representing the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) demanding that it pays R3.25 million in outstanding affiliation fees owed to the federation, and threatening to institute legal proceedings if NUMSA fails to comply

with this demand.

He described it as an "incredible move" which he said could only mean COSATU was now not only politically bankrupt, but financially bankrupt as well, following the

departure of FAWU and financial problems within several affiliates. "As part of this new and absurd strategy and in order to fill the coffers of this bankrupt federation, FAWU has equally been targeted," Craven added. "How else can they explain an attempt to recover money from workers they have expelled and said they no longer want or indeed those who have willingly left their ranks?" *Timeslive*


Ramaphosa offers 'moral, political support' to Gordhan

ZARAGOZA - This is the shocking moment when a one-eyed matador was gored by the horn of a bull and stamped on by the huge beast in Spain.

Juan Jose Padilla, branded 'The Pirate' because of the eyepatch he wears, was lucky to survive after the clash during the El Pilar Feria at the La Misericordia bullring in Zaragoza yesterday.

The 43-year-old, who fell to the floor after being charged at by the 100 kg animal, held the left side of his face in

agony as worried officials rushed to help him.

He lost an eye five years ago, and was lucky to escape serious injury in May when he was picked up and flung by a bull in Madrid.

In his latest horrifying clash, he appeared to be falling as the bull's horns made contact, and the massive animal landed its front foot on his stomach as the matador fell underneath him. He was rushed to hospital after taking a blow close to his eyepatch, in similar circumstances to the mauling which saw him lose his

left eye. Padilla, who was known as the Cyclone of Jerez before he lost his eye, was injured in Zaragoza when a bull's horn pierced his jaw and came out through his eye.

He underwent a life-saving five-hour operation to repair severe damage to his eye, bone, muscle and skin - his face reconstructed with titanium plates and mesh.

Ten years earlier he had suffered serious back injuries, but returned to the bullring, gaining a reputation for taking on the most fearsome bulls.

N Korea missile launch fails

SEOUL - South Korea and the US said yesterday the latest missile launch by

North Korea ended in a failure after the projectile reportedly exploded soon after lift-off. The South Korean Joint Chiefs of Staff said in a statement the



military believes the North unsuccessfully attempted to fire a mid-range Musudan missile. It said the failed launch was made near an airport in the North's North Pyongan province. South Korea's Yonhap news agency said that the missile was believed to have exploded soon after lift-off. AP

24 killed in stampede in India

VARANASI - Police say the final death toll in the stampede at a religious gathering in northern India is at least 24 people as thousands of devotees of a controversial guru tried to cross a bridge at once. The followers of Jai Gurudev, a leader of a local religious sect, had gathered on the outskirts of Varanasi, a Hindu holy town in Uttar Pradesh state, when the deadly stampede broke out on Saturday." We can confirm that 24 people have died in the incident. Nineteen of the dead are women," said police inspector general Hari Ram Sharma.

Suspect was in Syria two months ago

BERLIN - A bomb plot suspect found hanged in his cell in Germany was in Syria two months earlier with a group of Islamists, his brother said in an interview published on Saturday. The suspect, Jaber al-Bakr, arrived in Germany from Syria in 2015 and gained refugee status, but returned to Syria earlier this year, his brother Alaa al-Bakr told the German daily Die Welt.

Fears Hammond could quit Cabinet

LONDON - The Treasury last night moved to quash fears that Philip Hammond could be on the brink of quitting as Chancellor over the mounting Cabinet rift over Brexit.

Friends of Hammond claim he has been deliberately excluded from key No 10 meetings because of his outspoken criticism of Ministers who back the 'hard' Brexit option of the UK leaving the single market.

They fear that, at the age of 60, he will walk out of the Government rather than stifle his opposition.

On Saturday, a Treasury spokeswoman insisted Hammond would not 'throw his toys out of the pram' and was working 'to bring everyone together'.

The fears come as Theresa May faces a hostile reception at her first European Council in Brussels on Thursday where she

will hold informal talks on her Brexit strategy with other EU leaders.

The Prime Minister is also facing increasing pressure from opponents of a 'hard' Brexit. The Mail on Sunday has learnt that Ed Miliband and Nick Clegg are poised to mount a cross-party bid to force an imminent Commons showdown on the Brussels negotiations

The former party leaders will join pro-Remain Tory MPs to table a motion within weeks calling on the Government to publish a Brexit plan, which would have to be approved by the Commons before May could trigger the Article 50 withdrawal process.

And pro-Remain Tory backbenchers also intend to launch a series of Commons ambushes designed to stop May from pulling the UK completely out of the single market, a wrecking move some predict could lead to her Government falling within the year.

Anna Soubry, a leading figure in the 'soft' Brexit group dubbed the 'Remain resistance', warned that if the Prime Minister did not give MPs the chance to vote on the single market May would be entering 'dangerous waters'.

One plan being hatched by them is to put down amendments to the upcoming Great Repeal Bill enforcing our continued membership of the single market. Daily Mail

Police hacked to death in Myanmar

MAUNGDAW - Three police officers were hacked to death with machetes in restive northwestern Myanmar on Saturday, with their killers shot as they fled, the military said, after authorities claimed homegrown Islamist insurgents were behind a spate of deadly attacks.

Security forces have killed at least 29 people since raids on police posts along the Bangladesh border last Sunday, according to state media, marking a dramatic escalation in violence in the mainly Muslim area.

The government has blamed the raids on an Islamist group led by a Taliban-trained extremist who spent months training up to 400 recruits with the help of funding from the Middle East. If true, this would represent a dark new chapter for Myanmar's Muslim Rohingya minority, which has shown little taste for jihadist ideology despite being one of the most repressed peoples in the world. *AFP*

IS claims Baghdad bombing that killed at least 32

BAGHDAD - A suicide bombing claimed by the Islamic State group killed at least 32 people in Baghdad on Saturday, the deadliest single attack to hit the Iraqi capital in over three months.

The blast is the latest in a series of IS-claimed attacks targeting members of Iraq's Shiite majority in Baghdad that have left more than 60 people dead in less than three weeks. The latest attack, which hit the Shiite-majority Shaab area of north Baghdad, also wounded at least 36 people. Officials gave two different accounts of the attack, saying the bomber targeted either a funeral tent of one at which Shiite

Muslims distribute food and drinks on the occasion of the annual religious commemorations.

IS issued an online statement claiming the bombing and confirming the latter account of the attack, but a witness at the scene said the bomber had targeted a funeral tent, entering and blowing himself up as lunch was being served. "I saw with my eyes 20 martyrs on the ground," the witness said. The Saturday bombing is the deadliest to hit the Iraqi capital since early July, when a suicide bombing in central Baghdad set crowded shopping centres ablaze, killing more than 300 people.

Thai prince names regent to manage his crown

BANGKOK - Thailand's crown prince, unwilling to take over the crown immediately, has formally named a 96-year-old confidant of his late father the regent to manage the throne, but did not say how long the caretaker arrangement would last.

The message was conveyed late on Saturday in a speech by Prime Minister Prayuth Chan-ocha, which put to rest uncertainty about the succession following the death of King Bhumibol Adulyadej, who reigned for 70 years.

He died last Thursday aged 88.

Although Crown Prince Maha Vajiralongkorn is the heir apparent, he has said he needs more time to grieve with the rest of the nation before taking on the responsibility of the throne. Prayuth said Vajiralongkorn has issued a royal decree to name Prem Tinsulanonda the regent. Prem heads the Privy Council, a body of advisers to the monarchy, and was the closest adviser of Bhumibol.

He is also known to be close to Bhumibol's highly popular daughter Maha Chakri Sirindhorn.










Security restrained him as the WBC cruiserweight champion climbed towards Haye in anger. Message sent, Message received. This was box office!


Honda's Marc Marquez claims 3rd win



LONDON - Anthony Joshua and Wladimir Klitschko are on the verge of finalising a heavyweight clash with a date set for December 10.

Should the deal be made the two will go face-to-face at the Manchester Arena, the same venue in which Michael Bisping defended his UFC middleweight crown last week.

The bout will see Joshua, unbeaten in the 17 fights of his career so far, defend his IBF title while the WBA belt vacated by Tyson Fury could also be up for grabs.

However, the troubled boxer voluntarily gave up his heavyweight crowns on Wednesday night due to problems with drug-taking and depression, resulting in him losing his licence on a temporary basis.

It marked the second occasion on which his rematch with Klitschko had been postponed.

Opportunity

Joshua's promoter, Eddie Hearn, was quick to see an opportunity for a mouth-watering showdown, offering Klitschko the fight, and after a couple of weeks of negotiations, they are now going over the final details.

The British boxer had been scheduled to fight on November 29, but was yet to confirm an opponent.

Joshua won the IBF title earlier this year when he beat Charles Martin before defending it against Dominic Breazeale.

Jose Mourinho: It will be difficult for ref Anthony Taylor to perform well

MANCHESTER - Manchester United manager Jose Mourinho has said that referee Anthony Taylor has been given an impossible job taking charge of today's big Premier League game at Liverpool.

MANCHESTER - Pep Guardiola fears Manchester City may suffer a crisis of confidence in the Nou Camp on Wednesday after they have now gone three matches without a win — but he intends to lift the mood and ensure they can play Barcelona at their own passing game on his return to his former club.

City dominated against Everton but drew 1-1, following a 2-0 defeat at Tottenham and a 3-3 draw at Celtic, which halted their all-conquering start of 10 straight victories.

Asked if his team's confidence might suffer at the home of the Spanish champions, Guardiola said: "Maybe. If you analyse the three results where we haven't won, I try to analyse why we didn't win.

That is my job. So of course the confidence and the mood is much better when you win. But, guys, we are professional enough so that when we win we stay stable and when we



lose, we analyse the reason why."

But Guardiola insists he will take on Barcelona with his own passing football. "In Barcelona, for the last 15 years, they dominate possession the way they play," he said.

"I love the way they play. I'm going to accept to win or to lose and the team will be judged by that but, I'm

sorry guys, I'm never going to change the way I play football.

"It's the only thing I have. I can make a lot of mistakes and be judged by many things, but I only have one power: my teams play the way I want. No regrets. 'Try to be optimistic for what is going to happen in the future." Daily Mail

POCHETTINO POSITIVE AFTER BAGGIES DRAW



Murray beats Agut to claim Shanghai Masters title

SHANGAI - Andy Murray moved a step closer in his quest for the world No. 1 ranking as he capped a stunning fortnight in China with victory in the final of the Shanghai Rolex Masters.

Murray ended his spell in the Far East without losing a set in the 20 that he played here, beating Spanish No. 15 seed Roberto Bautista Agut 7-6 (1), 6-3 to claim his 13th Masters title.

After also winning the China Open in Beijing last week, it means Murray has now cut the gap on Novak Djokovic to 2 415 points.

It is possible that Murray could become world No. 1 for the first time as soon as November 7, although that would likely require back-to-back titles in Vienna and Paris and for Djokovic not to reach the semi-finals in the French capital.

Murray is downplaying that prospect, however, as he knows as well as anyone how capable the Serbian is of rediscovering the form that saw him hold all four Grand Slam titles at the same time just three and a half months ago.

Murray said: "I for sure have a chance just now. I'm not suggesting I have no chance of getting to No. 1. I'm just still aware how difficult it is going to be to get

"I have never had success like I have had the last few months in my career so to keep that going, I'm aware it's going to be a difficult thing to do. I need to keep myself motivated and be smart with my schedule and my time off.

"But I believe I can get there. These last few months have proved that to me." AFP



The tournament will feature teams from South Africa and Botswana. They will be competing against local clubs.


NNAS President Mandisa Sigudla said they were still working on the logistics of the tournament during the association's AGM held at Zakhele Community Hall on Saturday.


