





KING WALKS INTO A 'CITY OF THE FUTURE'

is Majesty King Mswati III was yesterday walked into the future.

The journey took place in Iskanda, Johor, Malaysia where a mega project called the Malaysia Forest City is currently under development.

This is a place where people can live low carbon lifestyles as all buildings are expected to be covered in greenery, just as it would be in a 'forest', all in the name of protecting the environment.

The project is expected to take an estimated 30 years to complete and will cost billions of US dollars.

The king described it as 'amazing'. This has been dubbed a modern development that will be the first of its kind in Southeast Asia, covering an area of 1 386 hectares.

Built on four man-made islands, the project will feature a lush urban gate-way with the largest mixed-use green development in terms of the number of units to be built with a vertical greenery and smart city design theme.

A total of eight industries, including education, healthcare and tourism will be the main economic pillars of growth at the Forest City which will also see the place as a car-free zone with luxury green living that co-exists with smart technologies and amenities.

Designed by Sasaki Associates, the first phase of Forest City, will include modern condominiums and high-rise coastal residences which would be open for global sale. The two to four-bedroom condominiums and high-rise coastal residences are exceptionally

designed and are situated within leafy foliage corridors and car-free avenues with gated security. This will be followed by luxury villas which are soon to be announced.

There are also plans for a high-speed rail service between Singapore and Malaysia.

The king was told that the next phase would include landscaping large ground-level parks and waterfront systems, in addition to an interesting-

sounding rooftop network of interconnected parks and gardens, as well as mangrove swamps and a green corridor. There are four main islands which will be man-made and each of the islands will be interconnected by roads.

Currently, reclamation works are ongoing at the site for the islands. They come in different sizes too which are; Island One - 979 Acres, Island Two - 1896 Acres, Island Three - 405 Acres and, Island four - 145 Acres.

About Country Garden Pacificview (CGPV)

GPV is the master developer and creator for Forest City project, a mixed development comprising residential and commercial properties on four reclaimed island.

Country Garden Pacificview Sdn. Bhd. (CGPV) is a joint venture company between Country Garden Holdings Ltd and Esplanade Danga 88 Sdn Bhd, an associate company of Kumpulan Prasarana Rakyat Johor (KPRJ).

Spans

The project completion spans over a period of 30 years. Since 2015, CGPV has been doing a number of CSR work in Johor according to the Country Garden Pacificview Blog.

The location of this massive project is at the Tuas Second Link and just under the bridge. A local landmark would be between Kampung Tanjung Kupang all the way to Kampung Pok.

King praises Forest City concept

is Majesty the King has heaped praises on Malaysia for promoting environmentally friendly developments.

Speaking after a tour of part of the first phase of the Forest City development, he said with the whole world grappling with climate change, the need to protect the environment was imperative.

"This is why we are so pleased to see that almost all the buildings here display a serious consideration towards the environment as everything is green," he said.

He said the development should serve as a model for many others to emulate.

The government has a stake in the project and the king noted this as a critical partnership necessary to drive economic growth towards achieving sustainable development goals.

"The cost projections are quite substantial which means a lot of investors will need to come in but it is good that government is there to support this kind of economic activity.

"It is obvious that this area is geared for tourist attraction and developing economic activity for the state. I have no doubt that tourists from all over the world will be attracted to it which will help you realise the desired objectives," he said.

Sectors

The king said Swaziland seeks to work very closely with Malaysians, the government and the different sectors in the various regions in order to enhance trade and cooperation, exchange programmes, tourism and other areas.

"Our coming here has helped plant the seed, now it should bear the desired fruits in the near future. I look forward to future cooperation with the group behind this development as well," he said as he congratulated the designers and architects of the project for a job well done.

SANDF bus crash death toll rises to 11

The South African National Defence Force says 11 of its personnel died in a bus crash yesterday.

"A total of nine (9) members were declared dead at the scene of the accident. One (1) member passed away en route to the hospital and another one (1) passed away upon arrival at the hospital," the SANDF said.

"There are thirty-one (31) members who have suffered various injuries with three (3) in a critical condition."

All members are from the Department of Defence's Mobilisation Centre in De Brug, Bloemfontein.

The military said the accident happened near Clarens in the Free State.

A total of 42 SANDF members were being transported in

the bus at the time of the accident.

"The cause of the bus accident is at this moment not known and will form part of the investigations. Names of the deceased will be communicated once their next-of-kin have been informed," the SANDF said.

The Minister of Defence and Military Veterans, Nostiwe Mapisa-Nqakula, as well as the Secretary for Defence, Dr Sam Gulube, the Chief of the SANDF General Solly Shoke and the Chief of the South African Army, Lieutenant General Lindile Yam, sent their "heartfelt condolences to the families, loved ones and friends of those that lost their lives and wish the injured members a speedy and full recovery from their injuries". CEO did not consule me – Ezulwini Town Board's chairperson

E zulwini Town Board Chairperson Busi Bhembe has come out to state that her board was never consulted before the CEO of the municipality

Vusumutiwendvodza Matsebula wrote to the minister of housing and urban development seeking his intervention.

Matsebula wrote to the minister seeking his intervention on his relationship with the board to avoid a situation where their relationship was irreparable.

He also highlighted that what was happening within the municipality could lead them to a commission of enquiry, which could result in the board being fired.

Protocol

However, Bhembe chose not to say much on the matter stating that protocol dictates that as a town board they cannot make any comments on the matter until they meet the minister.

"I really have no comment on the allegations made by the CEO as I was not notified by him prior to his letter directed to the minister recommending the firing of the council. Notwithstanding the serious challenges we are facing as a council in working with the CEO, we prefer to wait for the minister's intervention on the matter. We look forward to the consultations with the minister regarding the said letter and its contents," she said.

On further allegations that the board's finance committee's interference was making it hard for the CEO to execute his duties

well, Bhembe also stated that she was not aware what all that is about.

Matsebula, on the other hand said he urged the minister to work on the matter as he does not want their working relationship to be destroyed in its entirety. He said he still had a good working relationship with some of the councillors.

He disputes though that he is demanding the minister to fire the board.

"My letter is only talking about the minister intervening," he said, earlier this week.

Jiva Dlamini wanted out as executor of Phakama's estate

... He has been given until Thursday to step down following a letter that was written to the Master of the High Court compelling him to do so.

xecutor of the late public transport operator and Senator Richard Themba Dlamini of Phakama Bus Service, Isaac Jiva Dlamini has been given an ultimatum to recuse himself from being executor of the deceased's estate.

He has been given until Thursday to step down following a letter that was written to the Master of the High Court compelling him to do so.

Jiva has been accused of taking sides on the matter of his late sin's four wives and therefore the aggrieved party wants him out as executor of the deceased's estate.

He was therefore summoned by the Master on Thursday after he had been furnished with the letter.

This follows Jiva's statement in the Observer on Saturday where he accused the deceased's first wife Sarah Dlamini (nee Kunene) of greed following her move to get the High Court to nullify Dlamini's other three marriages.

Jiva said it is their view that Sarah's move is motivated by greed to have everything that belonged to her husband for herself with the

other wives not getting anything from the estate.

He said this in reference to High Court Judge Mumcy Dlamini's recent nullification of three other marriages of the former public transport operator after his first wife, Sarah, whom it is said he married through civil rites, ran to court seeking an order to declare those marriages null and void.

He said they feel that this move is motivated by materialism in battle for the deceased's estate.

Seeking

In reaction to that, one of Sarah's children then wrote to the Master seeking her intervention on the matter by bringing them to the round table so as to compel Jiva to step down as the executor of the estate.

Sarah is mother to prominent medical practitioner Dr Futhi Dlamini, Principal Secretary (PS) Tourism Emmanuel Dlamini and NAMBOARD Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Siphephiso Dlamini, businessman Muzi and Makhosazana Dube.

Before his death, Dlamini had nominated his cousin Jiva, who resides at Lavundlamanti near Siphofaneni, as the Executor of his estate upon his death.

He provided that Jiva should not be required to furnish security for the purposes of Executorship.

High Court Judge Mumcy Dlamini ruled that the late former Senator only had one wife, in terms of the law.

She declared that Sarah and Richard married on August 5, 1960 by civil rites, ending a dispute between her and three other women, who were married by the late businessman through Swazi Law and Custom.

The judge ordered that the Swazi Law and Custom marriage of Richard to Martha Makhanya, Jenneth Sihlongonyane and Cecelia Makhanya was bigamous, therefore declared them null and void.

Jiva in an interview with the Observer on Saturday this week confirmed that he was summoned to appear before the Master's office whereupon he was however disappointed that only one party to the four of his late cousin's marriages was represented.

He said while he had no problem with recusing himself as executor of the estate, but his requirement is that all the other wives should be represented before a decision is taken on him to recuse himself.

"I have no problem with the ultimatum, but the only problem which I also voiced to the Master is that all the parties should be represented. They should all be in unison that I should recuse myself before I can heed to that. I am being accused of taking sides on the matter," he revealed.


Meeting

When one of the children to the late who is said to have been present in the said meeting was called last night, he politely apologised that he was not going to comment on a private matter.

He said the picture that has been created of their family is inaccurate and would not want to comment.

In the earlier interview, Jiva had suggested that Sarah should have approached the High Court as soon as Dlamini took the other wives if she felt such marriages did not conform to hers.

"Why was she quiet all this time only to come out now and seek the nullification of the other marriages? She should have confronted the deceased while he was still alive or forever held her peace. The problem here is the estate and she is



showing signs of being greedy. If my cousin was still alive he would have tackled this issue rather than his first wife waiting until he is dead to make her move," he said.

"Loku lokwenteke kumnaketfu butulujane nje," he said when stressing that he smells a rat in the way things have unfolded where it pertains to the nullification of the three other marriages.

He further stated that the deceased was very outspoken about not liking marriage by civil rites.

Cop who stole E400 000 fired

The police officer who was reported to have been arrested for stealing E400 000 she solicited from traffic fines at Siphofaneni has since been fired from the service.

Information gathered by the Observer on Saturday can reveal that Sibongile M. Dube has been served with a letter terminating her employment at the Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSPS)

Charged

She had been charged with five counts including theft of E414 120, malicious injury to property and defeating the course of justice. She had also been charged with another count of stealing E1 500 and a second one of defeating the course of justice. The RSPS has since reacted with fury to the actions of the police officer by dismissing her from the service.

In the letter terminating her employment and signed by the National Commissioner (NatCom) Isaac Magagula, 2965 Constable Sibongile M. Dube was dismissed after being found to have on diverse dates between the years 2011 to 2015 whilst stationed at Siphofaneni Police Station as a traffic officer committed: "grave misconduct, to wit; unlawfully and wrongfully detaching and/or destroying a government receipt book, unlawfully and

wrongfully appropriating a sum total of E372 060.00 being Government revenue." It is stated in the letter that subsequently, she was charged for contravening the Schedule of Offences framed under Regulation 20(1) of the Police Regulations as read with Section 12(2) of the Police Act 29 of 1957 as amended. "As you will recall or be aware, you were tried by a Board of Officers and you were convicted on all the counts and sentenced to a fine of E200 each. In addition to the fine imposed upon you, the Board made a recommendation for your dismissal in accordance to Section 22 of the Police Act 29 of 1957 as amended. Through this communication, you are hereby informed that I have confirmed the conviction, but set aside the sentence.

Following the Board's recommendation and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 29(d) of the Police Act 29 of 1957 as amended, you are hereby dismissed from the Police Service with effect from the 19th of August 2016," reads part of the letter.

Instructed

Furthermore and pursuant to her dismissal from the Police Service, she was instructed to return all items of uniform and accoutrements issued to her to the Regional Commissioner of the Hhohho region by yesterday. It could however not be established whether she had returned the said items at the time of going to press last night.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communication Officer (PICO)
Assistant Superintendent Phindile
Vilakati confirmed the matter when reached yesterday. She further warned other police officers against deferring from exercising integrity at all times.

"It is imperative that all members of the police service behave and uphold the law. The police service will continue to stem out any elements that are seen to be against the law within the service," she said.

Meanwhile, the illicit activities of Dube were picked up by the office of the Auditor General (AG) which forced the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) to call the National Commissioner to come to parliament to explain the anomaly in the government books of accounts.



PM mourns Dr. Hynd's demise

qualifying as a doctor, Samuel Hynd pursued a career of great commitment and distinction, serving for many years as Medical Officer to the Royal Family and Medical Superintendent of the RFM Hospital and Clinics of the Church of the Nazarene, and from 1968-1972, as Minister of Health and Member of Parliament. Together with his father Dr David Hynd, he pioneered training for teachers and nurses and served the nation as a true Swazi missionary, speaking SiSwati fluently which brought him more closely to his patients, and being ordained as a minister of the Church of the Nazarene.

"Our condolences go to the family of Dr Samuel Hynd as well as the Church of the Nazarene and his friends."

Percy lashes out at anti-SD

otswana civil society groupings that put to question Swaziland's democracy credentials in hosting the Southern African Development Community Summit meeting have attracted equally unsavoury rebuff from Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane who has labelled the critics as' imbeciles' and their criticism 'lunacy'.

This follows comments attributed to Vice President of the Botswana Congress Party (BCP), Dr Kesitegile Gobotswang, who told the Botswana Guardian that his party was not impressed by the development.

"Although Swaziland is a sovereign state, the fact that King Mswati III is ascending the SADC chair this August is a matter of great concern to us because the country has thus far refused to embrace the values of democracy. This is an indication that the regional body is not committed to democratic values," Gobotswang is quoted to have said.

"We have no reason to entertain lunacy by political imbeciles from ungraded parties that have never won any elections in Botswana ace independence, more than half a century

All we can say is every politician worth his salt knows that unions and political parties are not banned in Swaziland. We have both registered and operating in accordance with our constitution, which happens to be one of the best in the world. If the King is a dictator, then he is a fake one that does not make his critics disappear or die. We have no political prisoners and no refugee camp anywhere in the world, typical of a true democracy," said Simelane.

In his view, the development is a setback for the region because the country is not competent to meaningfully intervene when there is a crisis, especially where democracy is the issue. Dr. Gobotswang said he would have liked a situation whereby geographical location does not automatically qualify a Intry to be a member of the regional Organisation.

"The European Union (EU) has a checklist which a country must satisfy in order to be allowed membership," he was quoted saying. He was joined by the President of the Botswana People's party, Motlatsi Molapisi who went on to rant about how the King was not qualified to hold the position of the chair...Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane says country has no reason to entertain lunacy by political imbeciles for condemning Swaziland's democracy credentials ahead of the southern African group of countries meeting here

manship of SADC.

The Botswana National Front Secretary for foreign affairs, Nelson Ramaotwana, like Gobotswang, notes that all countries, including Swaziland, are free to run their affairs according to their own home-grown processes. He however expressed doubt on the country's abilities to mediate between government and its people where matters of democracy were concerned. He further made the claims that later annoyed Simelane saying "civic right groups, including political parties and trade unions are, for all intents and purposes, banned," who added that the problem with SADC was that some of its members were compromised.

For his part, the Deputy Secretary General of the Botswana Federation of Public and Private Sector Unions (BOFEPUSU), Ketlhalefile Motshegwa, said he was disappointed that, while the whole world had criticised Zimbabwe for her democratic credentials, the world, including the western

powers, seemed to be tolerant of Swaziland. He alleged there was no bargaining council and those who raised their voices about abuse of power were incarcerated, adding that BOFEPUSU will not fold its arms. He announced a series of lobby actions against the country holding the chairman-

SD'S ROLE IN ZIM, MADAGASCAR CRISIS

outhern African leaders at a special summit in Swaziland responded to the controversial change of government in Madagascar while also examining an economic recovery plan for Zimbabwe in November

King Mswati III told delegates of the Southern African Development Community then that the new power sharing government in Zimbabwe had eased political tensions in that country and now its greatest challenge was economic recovery.

"We continue to be happily impressed by the progress made in the formation and operationalisation of the inclusive government," he announced to the leaders. "We are already witnessing the first fruits of Zimbabwean unity."

He also welcomed that government's appeal for USD2 billion in emergency funds to finance economic rehabilitation but not without mentioning that such a programme could not be implemented successfully as long as economic sanctions continued against Zimbabwe.

Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe was very pleased with the King's speech and

blamed western sanctions for the decline of Zimbabwe's economy and social services.

Western governments had imposed selective sanctions against certain Zimbabwean leaders because of what they termed corruption and human rights abuses.

King Mswati III said SADC leaders must also deal with what he called the forced removal from office of Madagascar's President Marc Ravalomanana, "We need to abide and comply with SADC protocols and treaties," he told the

"However, as history shows, the dictates of life are such that now and again challenges occur, resulting in unfortunate eventualities and problems which are not in line with our proto-

He concluded the unconstitutional takeover of power by what he called the de-facto regime in Madagascar violated the basic principle and treaties of SADC and therefore was not acceptable. Ravalomanana had resigned two weeks earlier and the military handed power to opposition leader Andry Rajoelina who was then installed as head of a transitional authority.





MPS IN TENSE DEBATE OF CONTENTIOUS PUBLIC ORDER B

There was intense debate amongst parliamentarians over the contentious Public Order Bill, with some members arguing that it banned freedom of assembly.

The Public Order Bill, 2016 seeks to promote and protect public order, health, safety and morals.

It also seeks to give effect to the fundamental rights of freedom of peaceful assembly and freedom of expression embodied in the constitution of the country.

While the objects of the Bill were good and quite some improvement from the 1963 Public Order Act, Manzini North MP Jan Sithole said the process outlined for people seeking to exercise that right was

too cumbersome. Sithole said the conditions which people were required to meet before getting permission to hold a public gathering were now more difficult than any time ever before.

"In fact this is banning marches and gatherings," said Sithole, lifting up the Swaziland Government Gazette Extraordinary for the Public Order Bill No.8 of 2016.

Proposed

With the proposed Public Order Act, Sithole said government has prepared a beautiful and attractive pie that was, unfortunately, infused with hot chilies.

Sithole said another concern was the consultations to be made before people or organisations were given permit to hold the public gathering were so wide and unclear the whole

process gave arbitrary power to the local authority from whom the permission was sought.

Another challenge, Sithole said, was that the objectives which the Bill sought to promote were not

defined.

The applicant seeking permission to stage a public gathering or event would not know the definition of public health, safety or morals, making the whole process subject

to abuse.

"This is a right that must happen but must be protected. Basically, these conditions are an ultimate refusal of the right because they make it inaccessible. It is upon the authority to make the enjoyment of this right possible and control it because it was a fundamental constitutional right. Therefore, its refusal is a violation of the constitution," said Sithole.

Madlangempisi MP Bongani Mdluli said getting permission to stage a protest march now would be more difficult, not that he was promoting the negative aspects of protest marchers.

MP Mdluli said it was clear that the set conditions would result in nobody getting the right to exercise that fundamental human right. He appealed to his colleagues to be honest to themselves on the matter because as the Bill stood, the country would not achieve what it sought to achieve, including readmission to the United States market controlled by the Africa Growth and Opportunity Act. He said the image of the country would remain tarnished. The Bill was eventually passed with amendments.

King has power to issue Executive Orders, PM tells MPs

rime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini told the House of Assembly His Majesty King Mswati has a constitutional right to issue Executive Orders as a head of State who enjoys such powers.

The prime minister made the remarks when debating the Public Order Bill that was finally passed with amendments. During the debate, some MPs argued that they could not pass the Bill because it was in contravention of the national constitution in that there was a clause that referred to a national commissioner of police, yet the constitution only made mention of a police commissioner. The MPs argued that to include in the proposed law the title of 'national commissioner' would be in contravention of the constitution.

The prime minister argued that the King issued a legal notice redesignating the title of commissioner of police to national commissioner, using the executive powers vested on him by the constitution. The prime minister further argued that the constitution

was like a Bible from which one could not just pick a verse and think it fully explains an issue. He said to fully understand a biblical verse there was need to read it with others and the same applied to the constitution.

Nkwene MP Sikhumbuzo Dlamini suggested that the matter be resolved the same way they handled a Correctional Services Bill, in which they faced almost a similar challenge in that whilst the constitution recognised a 'commissioner of correctional services', the Correctional Services Bill now talks of a 'commissioner general'. In resolving that matter, the House took a resolution that Justice and Constitutional Affairs Minister

Senator Edgar Hillary and Attorney General Majahenkhaba Dlamini must seek audience with the King to consult on the constitutionality of the matter.

MP Dlamini said, likewise, the prime minister should join Minister Hillary and the attorney general in consulting with the King on the matter. MP Dlamini said that did not mean they doubted His Majesty's executive powers but all they wanted was for the King to use the same powers to authorise them to make the amendment even though they felt it violated the constitution. In response, however, the PM said there was no need for him to consult on the matter, arguing His Majesty had already pronounced himself through the executive orders he issued in a form of a legal notice.

He argued that there was no point in seeking audience with His Majesty to consult on a matter whose answer they already knew. He wondered what the justice minister was going to consult on about because the King's position on the matter was clear.

'His Majesty must be advised properly'

anzini North MP Jan Sithole, who had raised the constitutionality of the title of the national commissioner, said he heard the argument by the prime minister but made it clear it did not satisfy

MP Sithole strongly argued that parliament was the last institution to allow the violation of the supreme law of the country. Sithole said the constitution stated clearly that any other law in contravention of it shall be considered null and void.

He said the very same constitution placed responsibility to every citizen to ensure the supreme law of the country was protected. Sithole said the King himself was bound by the constitution to exercise his executive powers within the constitution, not in violation of it. MP Sithole said if there was a need for an amendment of the constitution, the King should be advised to do that. To persistently respect the executive orders as the PM insist-

ed, Sithole said, would lead to more similar pronouncements until the constitution lost its shape.

Nkwene MP Sikhumbuzo Dlamini said the gazettes the PM referred to were themselves illegal because they were in contravention of the constitution.

To clear their names on the matter, MP Dlamini said the best option was to seek advice from the king. Manzini South MP Owen Nxumalo wondered what more advice his colleagues wanted because the PM was there in front of them giving counsel on the matter.

Delayed FPE payment strangling school principals

The continued delay on the payment of Free Primary Education (FPE) by government to schools is now frustrating principals as operations at some of these learning places are running at a snail's pace.

Before schools closed for the second term, some were struggling to purchase teaching aids in the form of stationery, chalk and others as the revenue was running dry.

According to sources close to the matter, so serious is the situation that some schools were even having difficulties in purchasing stationery used by teachers to aid the learning process. The source wondered how they are going to operate when they open for the third

The FPE programme was introduced some years back in an effort to make sure there is education for all as some children could not learn due to the fact that their parents could not afford to pay schools fees, while others are orphaned.

Primary education in Swaziland begins at the age of six and under normal progression it is a sevenyear programme that ends with external examination, the Swaziland Primary Certificate (SPC) in Grade Seven. This is a national assessment and is compulsory for every child to sit for in order to qualify to enroll for secondary school education. All school going age children should access primary education with or without barriers.

However, access to formal education is frustrated by several barriers such as poverty, hunger, and poor progression of children in the system.

Noted

The ministry noted a high repetition and dropout rate in the school system with low enrolments because children could not afford to pay for their school fees and stationery while there is no food at their homes.

The ministry's core mandate is the provision and attainment of quality, inclusive and affordable education opportunities for all pupils of school going age, including the out of school youth.

Interviewed about the current state of affairs, Swaziland Principals Association's (SWAPA) Welcome Mhlanga confirmed the situation.

Mhlanga said they had been making endless follow ups to government through the ministry of education as regards the payment of the FPE but there had been nothing forthcoming.

"In fact last week we approached the principal secretary in the ministry of education who assured us that he has forwarded all the rele-

vant documentation to the Treasury Department, but schools closed without us getting payment," Mhlanga said.

He said it had now become difficult for schools to operate since they cannot even afford to purchase teaching aids in preparing tests, examinations and other essential material.

Contacted for comment on the matter, Principal Secretary Pat Muir, said as a ministry they had now done all the relevant documentation to have the schools paid for the FPE programme.

"As of now as we've forwarded everything to Treasury Department and hope the schools will be paid anytime from now, we have done our part," Muir said.

All we, who work with ex convist, are asking for, is, please give these guys and ladies a second chance, so that they do not keep being the King's guests, because of the stigma we tend to attach to their coming from there and tend to pity their poverty and want them to stay that way; being pitied, despite their trying their level best to stay rehabilitated, hence going back to crime, as a result of challenges that come with being an ex prisoner or ex convict and the prevailing poverty that tends to come with it due to the stigma and attitude, when they are trying to make a descent living, this is more so when institutions that should be providing for such are also struggling just to survive.

I know that we as an organisation (SACRO)

have had tough a time; as we are gradually turning to being reptiles as opposed to mammals due to the scarcity of funding we almost forgot our mandate and just selfishly guarded our survival. This is why we tend to see the positive in what Hon MP Steffans has in mind and what he is doing for the ex offender and we say heads up Sir and keep up the good work and do not be discouraged.

We are so far undertaking an initiative where we want to engage with all those who share our passion and work with the view to see how we can complement each other as opposed to fighting over resources hence have asked our counterparts to please come together and work as one unit starting with a radio programme we did last week together with the Federation of ex Prisoners/Convicts.

We want to urge them to continue with the noble initiative of collecting everyone into a data base which we shall be using to source for appropriate projects.

Thanks MP Hans Steffens for teaching us that we need each other and working as a unit we will conquer recidivism and show that the initiatives by the Commissioner General work if only there would be enough resources to complement these efforts. We need a half way house to ensure that newly released prisoners are better groomed and prepared for their reentry to society in order to get back to the communities they offended.

Moving into another subject that of the victims of the crime, notably the offended individ-

ual and community. We are working on putting in place interventions that will need to fill this void for we have realised it exists, however due to scarcity of resources this has been indeed just a vision and mission with just no means to get them realised.

Nonetheless I do not wish to address everything here but the intension is to request for a platform where we can engage with the media one day, funds allowing so that they understand what we are going through and the major role they have to play upon the release of a convict, both young and old.

I need not mention the nightmares we have caused the recently released prisoners by the negative reporting and as such just wish to appeal that please give the ex convict a second chance and may we all learn to forgive just as we were taught by Jesus to try and forgive 70 time 7 times.

I rest my case.

ifferent organisations from the Southern Africa Development Community (SADC) yesterday marched along Manzini's streets after conclusion of the Southern Africa People's Summit. The summit precedes the SADC Heads of State Summit that will commence on Monday in the country. The different organisation from the entire SADC region yesterday took to the streets of Manzini in a march to create awareness on what had been discussed during the summit.

The Municipal Council of Manzini and the Indation for Socio-Economic Justice (FSEJ) in Swaziland with the Swaziland Economic Justice Network (SEJUN) were at loggerheads pertaining to the march and this led to the organisations to file an application before the High Court on Thursday evening. The bone of contention was that the Manzini Municipal Council had granted them permission to march along the city's streets yesterday, but later withdrew it on the grounds that it had been instructed by higher authorities.

Judge Mbutfo Mamba dismissed the application by the organisations to set aside the withdrawal. The judge said any party that challenges a local council's decision to refuse permission has liberty to approach the High Court and jump the magistrates court, but there has to be an application made first justifying why the appeal against the refusal was not filed before the magistrates' court as stipulated in the Urban Government Act. He dismissed the organisations' application with costs.

The organisations from the SADC countries, however, continued to stage the march yesterday and they were joined by representatives of international organisations from the United Kingdom, Morocco, France, Denmark, Sweden and Norway. "We proceeded with the march and it was a huge success and peaceful. The march was organised by the participants of the people's summit where we were discussing health, social and economic issues affecting the SADC region as a whole. The

We also talked about issues that are of concern in our respective governments and recommendations. We will then table our recommendations in the SADC Heads of State Summit," Dlamini said.

He added, "This was not a protest action, but a march where the intention was to create awareness to the people who did not attend the people's summit to share with them. It is just a solidarity march, nothing more," he said.

He said such marches take place every time and everywhere a SADC summit is held and the march was not against the government of the country alone, but it raised concerns of all the SADC countries.



KUKHANYA TO DELIVER E466M SICUNUSA -NHLANGANO ROAD IN MAY

n what has felt like eternity to most that are eager to use this road, Kukhanya Civil Contractors will finally complete and handover the E466 million worth 42.5km Nhlangano – Gege - Sicunusa road.

The ministry of public and works and transport has revealed that the road will be ready for use in May, next year. The overall works progress is now estimated at 58.3% complete.

The project road is 37.5km long from Nhlangano to Sicunusa and 5km from Gege to the Gege Border Post and the scope of works consists of the construction of 42.5km asphalt surfaced single carriageway road including two reinforced concrete river bridges and eight box culverts, cattle underpasses and ancillary works. Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini in his budget speech earlier this year disclosed that government had set aside E297 500 000 for the supervision and construction of the Nhlangano — Sicunusa road.

This has come after most people had lost hope following a halt of the project for some time due to delayed payments during its inception back in 2013. However, Acting Principal Secretary (PS) Vusi Matsebula has disclosed that the latest programme submitted by the contractor (Kukhanya) indicates a completion date of May 2017.

"Factors that contributed to the

delayed completion of the project in 24 months as earlier projected consist of delayed payments during the inception of the project where the Funder (BADEA and OBID) suspended payments of Interim Payment Certificates.

This was due to the involvement of a Portuguese entity, Gabriel Coutto. However, government concluded successful negotiations with the funders to solve this issue and the project is running smoothly without constraints. In as much as Gabriel Coutto is not on site, the Kukhanya/Gabriel Coutto Joint Venture still exists. Kukhanya boosted their capacity by engaging subcontractors for various aspects of the works such as structures (bridges), earthworks, paint hire, etc," he said.

Explained

The Acting PS further explained the decision behind awarding a decreased tender of E286 037 550 for the works in the construction of the road instead of the initially recommended E465 990 202 for the full scope by revealing that this was due to financial constraints. He said this scenario also resulted in numerous extension of time for the completion of the project.

"The ministry of public works and transport engaged both the ministries of economic planning and finance on the issue of the budget and it was agreed to award the works at a reduced scope of E286 037 550.57 to be executed in 15 months. It was envisaged that the full

scope of E465 990 202.85 to be executed in 24 months would be restored with a variation order with government raising the shortfall," he explained.

News

He also revealed that physical works commenced on July 17, 2013 and were scheduled for completion on October 16, 2014. However, due to the problems on the contract award as well as non-payment of contractor, the Acting PS said the contractor was granted an extension of time on the original 15 months project duration.

Project


"The extension of time was from August 2014 to September 2015, which means a signed variation order number was to take the project completion date to July 2016. A variation order was signed and issued to reinstate the project to its original scope of works and the overall works progress is now estimated at 58.3% complete," he added.

Meanwhile, the major bridge structures on this road include the Mkhondvo River Bridge whose structure consists of a 157.3m long incrementally launched reinforced concrete box type bridge with six internal continuous spans each 20.5m long and two external spans each 16.4m long.

The other one is the Ndlotane River Bridge whose structure consists of a 76.5m long, 3 span reinforced concrete deck/precast beam type bridge with 25.5m long spans. The minor structures include 17 box culverts.

PEOPLE LIED TO KING BURING SIBAYA'

...Bhekinkhosi chiefdom comes out to state that they have never charged people from Ngwazini E5 000 to bury their deceased family members and that those that submitted such to king were far from speaking the truth

The Bhekinkhosi chiefdom under Prince Sibonginkhosi has come out to lambast some citizens of Ngwazini for what has been termed blatantly lying to the King during the recent people's parliament (sibaya) that took place at Ludzidzini Royal Residence.

The area's spokesperson Prince
Makhosini Dlamini minced no words in
stating that there was nothing factual in
most of their submissions before His
Majesty the King. He said for starters, at
Bhekinkhosi they do not charge any
money to residents to bury their deceased
relatives hence it is not true that the
people of Ngwazini are charged E5 000 if
they want to proceed and bury their
relatives in the area.

The people's parliament was taken aback when some residents from Ngwazini blasted Manzini Regional Administrator (RA) Prince Gcokoma stating that he was making life difficult for them as he constantly states that their chiefdom does not exist hence they cannot access a number of national services. In unison, the speakers of Ngwazini who were mostly elderly women took turns in undressing the prince saying he was stalling development in the area with his stance that the Ngwazini chiefdom does not exist. They bitterly complained that their chief was not recognised in the country hence they were being forced to pay at least E5 000 to get permission to bury their dead relatives

"The life we live is sad because we are told that the Ngwazini chiefdom does not exist and our current chief that we know is not registered in the country's book of chiefs

This is stalling development in our area as for 20 years now we have been suffering," said LaSimelane who also requested the King to look into the matter in her submission during sibaya.

Another speaker, Busisiwe Mkhonta argued that even members of the Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSPS) had taken sides on the matter by joining in the dispute of their chief not being recognised. She said the police treated them badly whenever they mentioned that they are from Ngwazini hence they were even considering leaving the area to seek

refuge elsewhere as it was clear that their area had been erased from the country's

Dups Funeral Home was not sparred as they were also bombarded with accusations at sibaya. Tenele Vilakati said it was becoming a headache for people of Ngwazini whenever they lost their relatives.

"When we lose our relatives they do accept the corpses at Dups when we take them there. We then take it upon us to continue with the funeral arrangements. In the end they tell us we cannot collect the corpse without some paperwork and this is very confusing because we are not told such a requirement from the onset," she said.

She added that at the end they are told to fork out E5 000 to be allowed to bury their relatives something she said gave them a headache.

Issue

However, Bhekinkhosi chiefdom's Dlamini begged to differ revealing that the main gripe in the entire issue is a ruling that was made by His Majesty King Mswati III almost 20 years ago, which clearly stipulated that there is no Ngwazini chiefdom and the people of Ngwazini should pay their allegiance to Nyakeni as the area remains part of Nyakeni.

He said the problem here is that these people do not want to heed to the ruling by paying their allegiance to Nyakeni or change to Bhekinkhosi, which is where the issue of the purported E5 000 charge for burial stems from.

'We have never charged people E5 000 to bury their relatives in the area. What happens is that the people of Ngwazini are adamant that they are on their own and should not pay allegiance to Nyakeni and when death strikes they have to report such to their chiefdom to get permission to proceed with the burial. Since Ngwazini is under Nyakeni and is neighbour to Bhekinkhosi, some of them decide to come and report such at the Bhekinkhosi Royal Kraal and that is a where the matter of the E5 000 come in. It is only subject to respecting a general ruling that people must pay their allegiances (kugucula umnyango) to the authority of Bhekinkhosi if they want to be part of the chiefdom. As matters stand people are allowed to bury their loved ones without any charge, but are called upon to later return to the chiefdom to pay their allegiance and that comes with the payment of the customary cow, which at Bhekinkhosi is placed at E5 000," he explained.

He said to further clarify the matter, the people of Ngwazini have an option of recognizing their chief from Nyakeni without necessarily paying the E5 000 to be part of Bhekinkhosi. He said that is because the King's ruling clearly stated that they belong to Nyakeni and all they have to do then is pay their allegiance to Nyakeni to cut the matter short.

Dlamini qualified his statement by offering a brief background of the matter stating that it started with a minor squabble back then between the Mdlulis of Ngwazini and then Prince Jehovah of Nyakem as this was through livestock. He said even the late King Sobhuza II had attended to the matter, but when he died in 1982 all hell broke loose as the Mdlulis claimed they had land and were the chiefs of Ngwazini. He said most people joined the Mdlulis to pay allegiance to Ngwazini yet some did not know the actual truth to the matter.

Disclosed

"Even King Mswati III started working on the matter and rightfully disclosed at a point in time that he found the late king had already made a ruling on the matter and it was just that the ruling had not been pronounced. That is when the King delivered the ruling through Prince Tfohlongwane, but it was hard to accept by the people of Ngwazini.

They started forming alliances and falsely declared that the King had given them Prince Matatazela as their chief something that was disputed by other Princes. Ever since the King's ruling we have been in and out of court and the copy of the ruling has always absolved us," he added.

He also has expressed worry that some citizens from Ngwazini can just wake up and go speak ill of them by telling the King lies. Prince Makhosini said as the Bhekinkhosi chiefdom they stand by the King's ruling and will never bar people from burying their relatives in the area. He said it was also not factual that Prince Gcokoma came alone to remind the people of Ngwazini about the King's ruling stating that he was in the company of Chief Mdlaka Gamedze, Court Presidents Phosho Dlamini and Mhishwa Dlamini, the Manzini Station Commander and other officials.

King ruled there is no Ngwazini chiefdom

In what can bring to an end all the talk about the Ngwazini chieftaincy dispute that was reported during Sibaya recently, His Majesty King Mswati III ruled that Ngwazini is under Nyakeni hence there cannot be a chief in the area.

The King made this ruling back in 1997.

This is contained in a letter dated November 4, 1999 where then Swaziland National Council Standing Committee (SNCSC) Chairman Prince Tfohlongwane communicated the King's ruling to the Princes of Nyakeni, Nkiliji and Bhekinkhosi. This was a confirmation in writing of the King's ruling that was made and delivered to all parties concerned.

"In his judgement, the King-in-Council ruled that Ngwazini has always been and so remains a part of Nyakeni. The long established and well known boundaries between the areas concerned are as follows: between Nyakeni and Bhekinkhosi the boundary is the river Mahosha; between Nkiliji and Nyakeni and Bhekinkhosi the boundary is Ndlela Kayomi," read part of the correspondence.

Bhekinkhosi chiefdom spokesperson Prince Makhosini Dlamini said that is what they have and rely on in dealing with matter that concerns the people of Ngwazini. He said they expect everyone to respect the King's ruling.

'We're fully behind T.V, lokunye bekuluhlata'

hen Ludzidzini acting Governor Timothy Velabo Mtetwa otherwise known as 'TV' said some of the submissions made at Sibaya were not fully mature

some of the submissions made at Sibaya were not fully mature (betiluhlata) some laughed off his observation, but to the Bhekinkhosi chiefdom he could not have said it better.

Mtetwa said this before His Majesty the King on the last day of sibaya.

"Sekutsi letindzaba tenu letiningi tato betiluhlata," he said while implying that some brought matters to the King yet they had not exhausted all the proper channels of addressing them hence they were properly brought to the people's parliament.

Mtetwa justified his observation



by stating that most of the issues were supposed to be dealt with at chiefdom level, where the King had headmen, whose job is to listen to such concerns of the people.

Bhekinkhosi spokesperson Prince Makhosini Dlamini said indeed the acting Governor was spot on in his assessment of the submissions. He said some of the submissions especially those coming from Ngwazini were far from the truth and did not have to be made during Sibaya.

"We're fully behind the acting Governor on his assessment of the submissions," he said.

He further hoped that the King also saw that this is a matter that he long decided and should be laid to rest.

RIVER CONTAMINATED WITH HUMAN WASTE

Filled river used by many as source of waterRiver is one of the longest in the country

hile the country is still trying to recover from the devastating drought that has hit most parts of the Southern African region, the Mzimnene River, which is a source of water to many in Manzini, is now contaminated with human waste.

This comes after burst sewage pipes from a number of business outlets within the heart of the city spilled into the river below the bus rank. So serious is the situation that there is now a stench smell along the river banks and most affected are areas below the old Council

Swaziland Churches buildings, now ewned by the Lutheran Church. When our news crews visited the area this week, the water was discovered to be literally contaminated with human waste with the stench smell topping it all.

This is the very same river some boiled mealies vendors use below the bus rank. Interviewed about the serious environmental impact caused by the contamination, most of those found at the busy shopping complex above the river, expressed shock that the river was now contaminated, thus a health hazard. "The smell here is unbearable at times

and one can swear there is a sewer system below the river and we wonder what is being done about the situation," said Mandlenkhosi Dlamini, who works within the complex.

The major concern is that some people use the river as their only source of water in some areas since Mzimnene is one of the longest rivers in the kingdom

According to health specialists, there are a number of diseases causing microorganisms (pathogens) which when dis-

charged into freshwater environments, can survive for some time, and these pathogens mainly get into the water through human and animal waste. Such waste can get into the water through many different sources. Each time people go swimming or have primary contact with the contaminated water, they risk being exposed to pathogens sand risk and eventually getting sick, and such can be ingested through the mouth, the nasal passages or ears. Pathogens are microscopic organisms that cause disease in both human and animals with some more widely known as campylobacter and salmonella, amongst others, which cause diarrhoea and cold and flu like symptoms. Such pathogens are contained in human waste and may enter water ways through untreated sewage discharges, leaky sewage pipes, and septic tanks. When called for comment on the current status quo, Manzini Municipal Council's Public Relations Officer Mathokoza Thwala, said was much as such matters touched on the Swaziland Water Services Corporation, the businesses whose sewage systems were faulty should address such since it affected on the health of people. Meanwhile the SWSC could not be reached for comment, at least by the time this report was compiled.

Police fired rubber bullets and tear gas to disperse the crowd as the argument escalated throughout the night, with angry viewers vandalising the restaurant in Dhol village and attacking each other with sticks and knives.

"Two men got involved in an argument over the story of the episode, which later turned into a group skirmish," local police chief Yasinul Haque told AFP.

"During the fight, the angry mob vandalised the restaurant and continued the fight on Thursday morning," he said.

At least 100 people were injured during the brawl in the village 176 kilometres north-east of Dhaka, Haque said, with 15 requiring hospital treatment.

Several Bangladeshis blasted the government on social media for allowing the broadcast of Indian television channels which they claim "spread degenerate culture" in the Muslim-majority nation.



The country will host the SADC 36th ordinary Heads of State and Governments Summit which will run from 22-31 August 2016, the International Trade fair and the annual reed dance during the month of August. With the three events running concurrently, the country will be a hive of activity. The annual reed dance has become a tourist attraction and thousands of people will be descending into the country. The police service will be all out to ensure that the three events run smoothly while also ensuring the safety of everyone that will be in attendance. Police officers will be deployed all over the country to ensure the safety of the



nation and all visitors in the country during the period.

The SADC meeting will see about 15 Heads of States coming into the country for the summit and His Majesty King Mswati III will be assuming chairmanship of the region.

Acting National Commissioner of Police, William Dlamini said the police service was ready for the busy month of August especially the SADC summit as it was a landmark event for Swaziland. He said the police were prepared in all sectors to ensure peace and stability while maintaining order during the summit together with the other security forces. endlinilembi Prince Hynd spits fire at detractors

Ndlinilembi Chief Prince
Hynd has issued a stern
warning against detractors
who refuse to obey His Majesty
King Mwswati III's directives and
a ruling of the Supreme Court that
he is the rightful chief of the area
and all subjects must pay allegiance
to him.

He was also reacting to outbursts by dissident subjects of so-called Gebeni during the recent Sibaya, people's Parliament, making unfounded allegations against him much against both the King and the courts' rulings regarding his legitimacy and jurisdictions in the area.


Evicting

"As per my principles I had not considered evicting people because we all belong to the King and country. However, this was only subject to respecting the ruling that people must pay their allegiances to the authority of eNdlinilembi, kugucula umnyango. As matters stand I cannot live with people who do not pay allegiance to this chiefdom because they pay allegiance to other chiefdoms, that means they do not belong here."

He added that the dissident subjects were only a handful under the command of one Kunene who has always regarded himself as the Indvuna of the area by appointing himself

The prince argues that the highest authorities of the land, that of the institution of the King and the Supreme Court, clearly state that he has no such authority.

His band of followers are accused of destroying homes belonging to

new settlers or other residents resettled in the territory they claim to be theirs in Gebeni.

"I am now forced to take other decisions such as effecting evictions because if people cannot respect the ruling of the King and that of the courts then they are not worthy to being in our midst.

Personally

The prince further said he never at any time ran to the courts but his detractors, saying instead he personally appealed to the King against the entire band of men who called themselves members of the Gebeni Inner Council, a body that is non-existent by any authority in the entire eNdlinilembi under which Gebeni is ruled.

"I have all along been lenient with them considering the amount of damage they have caused, the next action I will take we see them only having themselves to blame."

At the centre of the persistent exchanges is the railway line which will require certain identified residents to relocate and be eligible for compensation but if these do not respect the authority of Prince Hynd they might not be assisted by that traditional authority.

Compensation

"I can't vouch for them for compensation if I do not know them, officially."

The prince said the Kunene rebel leader was only misleading the people and by so doing packing his own belongings out of the area, *uti-bophela yena umtfwalo*.

He expressed appreciation that members of the Royal household of the Gebeni area were not behind the resistance by the Kunene band of men.

To exercise his authority he said he would refer to Swazi culture and custom to enforce authority adding that those who went to peddle lies before the King and the nation at Sibaya were only bent on tarnishing his name because throughout all the defiance campaign the name Hynd had not featured.

Distracted

"I'll stick to the rules and ensure governance of this area by the rule of law, I will not be distracted by dissidents."

Also present were Liqoqo (Swazi National Council) members, former Prime Minister Mabandla Dlamini and Mandla Dlamini, Secretary of the Liqoqo Council.

Princes Mbombo and his brother Mahlobo have, for the past six years, given Prince Hynd a torrid time over the status of eNdlinilembi where they were allocating land, calling meetings and re-settling subjects of their own at eNdlinilembi.

However, a ruling last June by the King stipulated that the duo could only exercise such rights of resettling subjects at the Kuhlushwana Royal Residence in the Shiselweni region, where their mother (Inkhosikati) was allocated land, not eNdlinilembi where the rightful chief is Hynd Dlamini who is also a prince.

It would seem Prince Hynd, overstretched his generosity when he announced that he had no problem with those who were already allocated land but had been misled into believing that they were not under him. He opened both his hands shortly after the King's ruling was announced.

As per Swazi custom Hynd presented the King with a beast and handed it to Manzini Regional Administrator Chief Gcokoma.

Atrocities

This was to mark an end of atrocities especially because relations were at their all time low with some residents being forced to bury their loved ones under the cover of darkness in fear of retribution for paying allegiance to one of the parties in total defiance of the other faction.

Prior to the recent final order, in June 2011 a directive from Liqoqo was issued to the effect that "Endlini Lembi area was allocated (Liphakelo) to Inkhosikati LaMatsebula and currently Prince Hynd is the Chief of The area.

Prince Mbombo and Prince
Mahlobo belong to Inkhosikati
LaMatsebula who was allocated at
Kuhlushwana, Lavumisa area,
Shiselweni region and therefore
they do not have a right to allocate
land and call meetings at
Endlinilembi area and that they can
only exercise such rights at
Kuhlushwana Royal Residence,
Lavumisa area".

Two girls die after circumcisions

REETOWN - A teenage girl died after undergoing a botched female circumcision in Sierra Leone, police said on Thursday, just days after the death of a 10-year-old girl in Guinea.

Female genital mutilation (FGM) is widespread in the neighbouring West African countries, with about 90% of women in both countries undergoing circumcision.

Teenager Fatmata Turay died after she was circumcised in an initiation ceremony in the village of Mabolleh in north Sierra Leone and three women involved, including the girl's aunt, have been arrested, police said.

"There will be an investigation into the circumstances which led to the death of this girl," said vice minister of social affairs Rugiatu Turay.

The death comes just days after a 10-year-old girl in Makpozou, a forested area in the south of Guinea, died in similar circumstances, according to the country's social action ministry.

The child died in a circumcision camp for young girls, the ministry said.

Guinea's government urged communities that practise FGM to "stop sacrificing the girls", and said it was committed to the fight against the "vile practice".

Female circumcision is common in West Africa, where it is considered a female rite of passage and where practitioners can earn up to \$50 per girl.

Sierra Leone recently ratified a 2003 African Union protocol that seeks to ban FGM.

The theme for the industrialisation week is, Resource Mobilisation for Investment in Sustainable Energy Infrastructure for an Inclusive SADC Industrialisation for the Prosperity of the Region.

Text week Tuesday marks the beginning of the Southern African **Development Community** Industrialisation week to be hosted by the kingdom as part of the SADC Summit, which is trending this month.

The three-day programme to be staged at Esibayeni Lodge, is expected to feature different subprogrammes on various topics towards the industrialisation drive within SADC.

Formulated

The aim of the industrialisation week is to popularise the SADC Industrialisation Strategy and Roadmap 2015 - 2063, which was formulated in the context of existing national and regional policies during the August 2014

Summit held at Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe.

The SADC strategy was anchored on three pillars: industrialisation, competitiveness and regional integration. It is also aimed at optimising the use of Africa's resources.

This is quite critical given that the some of the problems hindering the industrialisation of SADC countries include, amongst other factors, lack of capital to invest in machinery, high lending costs from financiers, inadequate infrastructure and limited industrial capacity.

Therefore, the strategy envisages substantial quantitative shifts in industrial structure, manufacturing, production, exports, particularly those in the medium and high technology categories, while doubling industrial employment.

Some of the specific quantitative goals of the strategy include;

- To increase regional growth rate of real GDP from four percent annually since 2000 to a minimum of seven percent a
- Doubling the share of manufacturing value added (MVA) in GDP to 30 percent by 2030 and to 40 percent by 2050, including the share of industry related services.

- Increasing the share of medium and high technology production in total MVA from less than 15 percent at present to 30 by 2030 and 50 by 2050.
- To increase manufactured exports to at least 50 percent of total exports by 2030 from less than 20 at present.
- To increase the share of industrial employment to 40 percent of total employment by

The strategy is also transformational in terms of socio-economic transformation nationally and regionally. It seeks to accelerate growth momentum and enhance the comparative and competitive day advantage of the economies of the region, diversify and broaden the industrial base, enhance productive capacity, develop regional value chains which are capable of interacting with global value chains, export diversification, natural resources beneficiation, increase regional trade, and to build collaborative partnerships between governments, private sector, civil society, and development partners as a compact for industrialisation.

One of the strategic interventions includes strengthening small and medium scale enterprises. This talks to developing an integrated strategy for SME development to provide support for operational capacity and use procurement policy in order to mainstream the SMEs into the economy.

Other key interventions are macroeconomic policy convergence, accelerated regional industrialis ation, whereby national policies and plans are drawn in line with the SADC regional industrialisation, removing binding constraints, frontloading industrialisation through diversification in production of goods and accessing of markets, mainstreaming gender and youth issues.

The implementation of the strategy is divided into three phases.

Phase one began in 2015 and will end in 2020, phase two will run from 2021-2050, while the last phase will run from 2051 to

Despite its regional approach, the implementation of the Industrialisation Strategy is the responsibility of Member States, whereas, the development of regional infrastructure is a shared responsibility by Member States.

Member States are to make savings and invest on infrastructure development through domestic sources to fund industrialisation based on the regional priorities.

SECOND SABF CONFERENCE

he first Southern Africa Business Forum (SABF) Conference took place in the margins of the SADC Heads of State Summit, on August 11-12, 2015 in Gaborone, Botswana.

During the first SABF Conference, a Savuti Declaration emerged and was presented to the SADC Heads of State Summit.

The Savuti Declaration detailed the findings of the Southern Africa Business Forum and commitment of the private sector to act towards regional economic integration in the SADC region.

Six working groups were established to address key challenges which private sector firms experience when doing business in the SADC region.

The six working groups were Trade Facilitation, Agro-processing, Industrialisation and Regional Value Chains, Transport Corridors, Energy, and Water Sector.

During the second SABF Conference, a Declaration is expected to be formulated as an outcome of the meeting to be presented to the Heads of State.

The event is also intertwined with an exhibition aimed to exchange information, build relationships and develop new markets, which also forms part of the SADC Industrialisation Strategy and Roadmap 2015 - 2063 core pillars.






The reed dance festivities start on Tuesday, August 23 and finishes on Monday, August 29.

I say this because ahead of this Summit, His Majesty the King gathered the Nation to the Cattle Brye (Sibaya) where he addressed them about the summit and further urged them to express themselves on things that are of concern which may have a bearing coming to this important meeting of States.

People from all walks of life, for six days, had their say on political, social and economic issues.

Noted

It was noted that whilst many spoke, from the very old to the young, prominent multiparty advocates missed the opportunity.

SWADEPA leader, Manzini North MP Jan Sithole remains the only prominent figure that sees value in contributing to nation building exercises commissioned by His Majesty the King.

His voice is heard within the structures, but the many others who have lobbied the international community to put pressure on the country to unban multi-parties have continued to shun such an open forum.

It is such conduct or behaviour that continues to worry the majority of Swazis as to whose mandate are they pushing when they don't want to be party to locally engineered platforms to influence the change they so desire.

Impression

Such people want to create an impression that Swaziland's participation in SADC and other global bodies is misplaced just because we don't endorse a particular political system.

Each country chooses its own political system and no one should impose it's own

upon anyone unless that system totally contradicts with the values and objectives of such structure.

Swaziland chose for close to 400 years to be a Kingdom. Our political organisation therefore will differ from countries that are republics.

Being a Kingdom does not mean we don't have to respect political systems of other countries. We accept that they have chosen their systems because it best represents their people and Swazis should also be respected.

We are also alive to the fact that what also influences the choice of a particular political system is the political economy of that particular nation, for instance the size (both land mass and population), the tribes, and language.

It may be argued that a unitary political system instead of a multi-party based political system is not suited for a small country like Swaziland with a singular language and homogenous small population.

The question then is what is the noise all about?

In most cases, just like in any multi-party system the issue is on the effectiveness of the system in delivering services to the peo-

People will always disagree on the forms of service delivering, but it may not necessarily mean that it needs complete overhaul, unless it is an extreme case.

Concern

Like the many people who spoke at the cattle byre we noted that their major issues of concern were on service delivery by the government.

Systems can best perform by change of guard. In Monarch's you change the government, whilst in multi-party systems, even the entire leadership changes hands.

So as we welcome our delegates we need to reflect that Swaziland just like many other countries of the world has its fair share of service delivery issues and governance remains work in progress.

We remain a peaceful nation and one that prides itself in culture and one that remains rooted in traditions. The institution of the Monarch remains a unifying figure and pillar of the Nation.

We hope what you will see or hear is nothing that you are not used to in your various countries.

The reason we have SADC is that as countries we need to explore ways and systems that would contribute to positive development and well-being of the region.

We take it that all those who are raising issues of concern are doing so for the betterment of the region.

Dealing with Diabetes

astro paresis is a disorder affecting people with both type 1 and type 2 diabetes in which the stomach takes too long to empty its contents (delayed gastric emptying).

The vagus nerve controls the movement of food through the digestive tract. If the vagus nerve is damaged or stops working, the muscles of the stomach and intestines do not work normally, and the movement of food is slowed or stopped.

Just as with other types of neuropathy, diabetes can damage the vagus nerve if blood glucose levels remain high over a long period of time. High blood glucose causes chemical changes in nerves and damages the blood vessels that carry oxygen and nutrients to the nerves.

Causes of Gastro paresis in Diabetes

Gastro paresis is caused by damage to the vagus nerve, which regulates the digestive system and makes muscles function. Diabetes is a leading cause of gastro paresis, accounting for about one-third of cases. Damage to the vagus nerve keeps the muscles of the stomach and intestine from functioning properly. In gastro paresis, food remains in your stomach because it is not processed and pumped through the intestines.

Other causes of gastro paresis include:

- Viral infections.
- Abdominal surgery with injury to the vagus nerve.
- Drugs such as narcotics and some antidepressants.
- Amyloidosis (deposits of protein fibers in tissues and organs) and scleroderma (a connective tissue disorder that affects the skin, blood vessels, skeletal muscles, and internal organs)

Symptoms of Gastro paresis in Diabetes

The symptoms of gastro paresis linked to diabetes include:

- Heartburn or reflux (backup of stomach contents into the esophagus)
- Nausea
- Vomiting undigested food
- Poor control of blood sugar
- Feeling full quickly when eating
- Abdominal bloating
- Poor appetite and weight loss


Complications of Gastro paresis in Diabetes

If you have diabetes and gastro paresis, you should be aware of the following complications:

- Food that stays in the stomach for a long time can spoil, which can lead to the growth of bacteria.
- •Food in the stomach can harden into a lump called a bezoar. Bezoars can cause blockages in the stomach that keep food from moving into the small intestine.
- Gastro paresis can cause additional health problems for people who have diabetes. When food finally does leave the stomach and enters the small intestine, there is a rise in blood sugar levels. Gastro paresis can make it difficult for the person with diabetes

In severe cases, daily vomiting may occur.

Diagnosing Gastro paresis in Diabetes

According to American Diabetes
Association, if you have diabetes and your
doctor suspects gastro paresis, he or she will
review your symptoms and medical history
with you. Your doctor will also perform a
physical exam and may order certain blood
tests, including blood sugar levels. Your
doctor will want to make sure an obstruction
is not the cause of your symptoms. Tests
used to diagnose gastro paresis may include:

Barium X-ray: You drink a liquid (barium), which covers your esophagus, stomach, and small intestine and shows up on X-rays. This test is also known as an upper GI (gas-

trointestinal) series or barium swallow.

Barium beefsteak meal: You eat a meal with barium in it, and the doctor uses an X-ray to watch how your stomach digests the meal. The rate of digestion will tell your doctor how quickly your stomach is emptying.

Radioisotope gastric-emptying scan:

You eat food that has a radioisotope (a radioactive substance) in it, and then lie under a scanning machine that detects the radiation. If the scan shows that more than half of the food is still in your stomach after 1.5 hours, you have gastro paresis.

Gastric manometer: A thin tube that is passed through your mouth and into your stomach measures the stomach's electrical and muscular activity to determine how

quickly it is digesting food.

Electrogastrography: This test measures electrical activity in the stomach using electrodes placed on the skin.

Ultrasound: This imaging test uses sound waves to create pictures of body organs. Your doctor may use ultrasound to eliminate other diseases.

Upper endoscopy: This procedure involves passing a thin tube (endoscope) through your esophagus to examine the lining of your stomach.

VETERAN MUSICIAN MSHIKISHI MNDZEBELE STILL STANDING

espite having turned 61 years on July 27 and thus qualifying to be amongst the country's senior citizens, Mbhaqanga music legend Mshikishi, aptly called 'Gorilla Man' Mndzebele, is certainly not one to retire or tire up anytime soon.

Many would have thought it was time for the 'mkhulu' to bid his throngs of followers or the microphone farewell but such thoughts have seemingly not crossed the mind of this gifted artist in Mndzebele.

He certainly is one who's seen the rough and tough times of this industry having earned peanuts throughout his career. The younger generation is living off their talents nowadays but Mshikishi entered the music industry at a time such was unheard of.

Just like a voice of one crying in the wilderness, he for sometime bemoaned the paltry pay given to local artists at the expense of foreign ones who got decent rewards.

No wonder despite his toiling and sweating over the years, he still rides public transport to Ntondozi, his home area, as opposed to owning an automobile.

These storms of life he weathered just like an oak tree that survived all kinds of weather. But the good news is that parliament recently passed the Copyright Act, something that would see artists living off their talents through earning decent income from airplay and the likes.

Mshikishi emphasises he'll stick around



KNOW YOUR FRIENDS

t is an undeniable fact that we depend on each other as people for livelihood; we are nurtured by our parents at a tender age then slowly become independent and tend to ourselves.

This clearly shows that we depend on each other. That being said, we need friends to survive in this life. There are things we go through, especially we women, that need to be shared and it does not matter if we get advice or not. Some things we cannot share with our colleagues, boss, teacher, husband and parents; we just need friends.

Sometimes it is not all about sharing problems or whatever; we also need someone to go out with and do fun stuff with. There are different people with different talents; so to say, we need different kind of friends for different aspects of our lives.

According to Rodale.com.Inc, these are the type of friends that we need:

1. A childhood friend

Longtime intimates are special for many reasons. They knew you and your family while you were growing up and likely have many memories and stories of you that no one else does. "These friends remind you that you are still the person you've always been," says Rebecca G. Adams, PhD, a leading friendship researcher and sociology professor at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. Nurture these ties by starting a members-only website—groups on Yahoo, Google, or Facebook are free and make it easy. Use them to plan vacations or share links to digital photo albums. Or keep things low-tech—just stick a card in the mail now and then, and stay in touch with phone calls.

2. A spiritual friend



A study from Duke University Medical Centre found that people who regularly attended religious services or engaged in activities such as prayer, meditation, or Bible study had a 50% lower risk of dying over a six-year period than others of the same age and health status. That's not to say it's easy to forge a connection in a room of 300 worshippers or while meditating on your own. Seek more intimate opportunities at a local church or temple: Volunteer in a canned food drive campaign, or attend a lecture series. Or try a neighbourhood yoga center or community college; they often offer spiritually meaningful courses.

3. A younger friend

Research shows that an essential element of a happy life is to nurture and feel useful to others—by cooking a wholesome meal, say, or passing on what you've learned through experience. For many women, that itch gets scratched by raising children. But mentoring younger friends (from the office, for example) can give you that same feeling, Blieszner says. To maximise the benefits of this friendship, let advice flow in both directions. A younger confidante can explain the social networking site du jour or offer a fresh take on current events.

4. Your partner's friends

The more a couple's family and friends intermingle, the happier spouses are after even just one year of marriage, found one study that examined the social circles of 347 couples. "We were surprised," says researcher Kenneth Leonard, PhD, a professor of clinical psychology at SUNY Buffalo. "Including your spouse in your network

5. Yourself



"Think of what makes you fall in love with someone: how genuine, sincere, and caring they can be; the unconditional love they offer, no matter what. Doesn't that describe how you should feel about yourself?" Peeke recommends you repeat the following mantra as a reminder: I love and honour myself as I do the other important people in my life. To give yourself the TLC you deserve, write down seven things that make you feel happy and healthy (cooking dinner, talking to a friend, running, reading a book), and make sure you do at least one every day.

Here is what the beautiful talent had to say:


When did you discover your talent/love for music?

memory because all was just perfect. The organisation of the event was top notch, the sound and lighting was brilliant, all the artists put their best foot forward, and the crowd was the best. It remains one of the best moments in my music career thus far. I really can't wait for it to be released to the public officially.

This moment actually was a culmination of all the great memories that I have had since joining the Women in Praise auditions last year and being part of the preparation process.

Before that, when my church Jesus Calls Worship Centre recorded an album a few years back, I had to lead a song for the first time in front of a big audience and is a day I will never forget.

What motivated your first ever headline show and what are we to expect? Which song do you hold dear and what message does it convey to you?

I still go back to the people around me, they have played a big role in my musical journey, and even helped build the little confidence that I now have. And while still growing in God and musically, I learnt that God uses all in different ways that we spread the gospel. Some were given the gift of preaching the word, some minister through dance but entrusted with a voice to minister in music to his people.


Process


"That is exactly what we do, we collect different style and later showcase and maybe sell it," said Masuku, who is cofounder of Swazi Styled Collectives.


"I started performing in the Swaziland 50 years ago and have been there almost every year since then.







he SADC Success Stories initiative is intended to increase the public visibility of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and to showcase some of the achievements and benefits of regional integration in the belief that SADC is not sufficiently well understood in terms of its mandate, programmes, activities and impact.

Regional success stories and positive results are documented in this publication in a well-informed and accessible manner to demonstrate the benefits of regional integration to SADC citizens, contribute to the spirit of a common future, and generate interest in SADC and its potential.

This year marks 35 years of SADC progress, including its growth from nine to 15 Member States in mainland Southern Africa and the islands

At its formation as the Southern Africa Development Coordination Conference (SADCC) in Lusaka, Zambia, in April 1980, the leaders of the region sought to demonstrate their vision of unity through the tangible benefits of working together.

SADC has come a long way since its transformation into a regional development community in 1992.

From this solid foundation, the region has transformed into a cohesive Community, which is determined to deliver a better standard of living for the people of the region.

The reform of the SADC structure and its institutional framework since 1992 has shown the strong commitment by Member States to consolidate regional economic and political integration, while accelerating the process towards an integrated region as part of a continental African Economic Community.

In pursuit of the regional integration agenda, SADC Member States have since 1992 signed 27 protocols and a number of declarations, charters and memoranda of understanding on various matters, ranging from trade, mining and finance and investment to illicit drugs, forestry and shared watercourses, as well as the empowerment of women and young people.

Out of the 27 protocols, 24 have come into force so far after being ratified by two-thirds of the signatory Member States.

Although there is still a long way to go, we believe that these and other initiatives have improved the lives of SADC citizens.

For example, the One-Stop-Border Post initiative has proved a viable development in eliminating trade barriers through reduction of clearance time and cost, with benefits extending to consumers further afield.


Similarly, development corridors have helped boost industrial growth, especially in landlocked countries, by providing cheaper alternative transport routes to seaports.

Equally, the establishment of river basin commissions has made it easier for joint management and utilisation of transboundary water resources

The purpose of this article is to highlight these SADC achievements, with a focus on how regional integration has benefitted citizens, thus promoting greater awareness and participation by the people of the region and their institutions in the process of regional integration.

SADC SUCCESS STORIES



SADC Vision

The vision of SADC is one of a Common Future, a future within a regional community that will ensure economic wellbeing, improvement of the standards of living and quality of life, freedom and social justice, and peace and security for the people of Southern Africa

Facilitation trade, reducing time, costs

If Zimbabwean truck driver Godfrey Magaba had a choice, he would use only the Chirundu border post between Zambia and Zimbabwe to ferry goods across the region.

"The service at Chirundu has greatly improved," he says. This is in contrast with other border crossings across the region where customs and immigration procedures may take several hours or even days to be completed.

The massive reduction in time needed to clear customs at Chirundu is due to the successful launch of the One-Stop Border-Post initiative in November 2009.

This was in line with the SADC Protocol on Trade ratified in 2000. The Protocol advocates for the elimination of barriers to trade as well as the easing of customs and transit procedures.

Under this scheme, immigration and customs procedures are carried out just once in each direction, in contrast to the situation at most border posts in the region where paperwork must be completed on both sides. Magaba says the simplified passage at Chirundu has saved his company huge sums since he no longer spends long periods waiting to cross. In the past, it took commercial trucks between four and six days to cross the Chirundu border. The typical charge for a stationary truck at the truck stops at the border is about US\$300 a day, meaning Magaba's company had to spend up to US\$1 800 to cross the Chirundu border.

These costs were passed on to the end-user, making goods more expensive for consumers in the region. Since the introduction of the one-stop border initiative at Chirundu, the crossing time there has been reduced to less than 30 hours on average. Vehicles with pre clearance can even cross on the same day.

Half of SADC's 12 continental Member States are landlocked, leaving major centres without direct access to a sea port.

"Historically, our border posts were created not

for trade, but for military and security reasons and now we need to change that to promote trade and the movement of persons throughout the region," says Lovemore Bingandadi, Transport Corridors Advisor at the SADC Secretariat. According to the Zambian Ministry of Commerce, traffic at Chirundu has more than doubled since the One Stop Border 4 Post (OSBP) was launched in 2009.

"If the border crossing adopts 24- hour operations, then we can easily achieve same-day crossing for the majority of commercial freight trucks," Bingandadi explained.

16 of the 35 most important border posts in the region have been identified as candidates for conversion to the one-stop system by 2020.

For now, Chirundu is the only operational OSBP of its kind in the region. However, Bingandadi expects more to follow quickly, once the most difficult groundwork of putting in place policy and legal frameworks are completed.

South Africa is in the process of adopting a national policy and strategy which will allow the Beitbridge and Lebombo border posts, among others, to work towards operating as OSBPs.

At Beitbridge, feasibility studies have shown that paperwork, currently requiring 24 steps on each side of the border, could be reduced to just eight once the OSBP is operational.

The opportunity cost for commercial companies is about US\$250-500 per day when the truck is stationary. More efficient border crossings means more efficient business as both vehicles and crews can be more productively utilised. The reduced time spent at the border by drivers and goods also reduces the chances of social ills such as corruption, pilferage and increased exposure to risky sexual behaviour.

Equally, accidents from hazardous cargoes being parked for long hours at border posts are reduced. And getting business back on the roads quickly helps to drive greater business growth in the region.

DEVELOPMENT CORRIDORS

THE highway linking South Africa and Mozambique has made a world of difference to Mozambican Aly Ibrahimo Lalgy's family business

"South Africa represents 50 percent of our business," says the general manager of Lalgy Transport, a transport company with over 350 trucks serving the regional market.

"If we didn't have the Maputo Development Corridor, our income would be about 20 percent of what it is now," says Lalgy.

It is a world away from when his father and uncles started their truck business 30 years ago. Then roads were poor and narrow. Now the company's trucks are among the steady stream of vehicles that make their way along the busy stretch of road daily. In 1996, the Mozambican and South African governments signed an agreement establishing the Maputo Development Corridor, which is a network of roads, railway transport and logistics facilities connecting the port of Maputo to South Africa and Swaziland. The corridor provides more than just a trade route – it drives business growth.

It aligns with SADC's Spatial Development Initiatives, a strategy to connect industries in landlocked countries to seaports and develop the inherent natural endowments of the corridor. The Maputo Development Corridor is one of 18 transport corridors in the region, explains Lovemore Bingandadi, Transport Corridors Advisor at the SADC Secretariat. It is the most successful development corridor in SADC, having attracted more than US\$5 billion in investment since its inception.

This includes U\$\$500 million invested in the port of Maputo since 2003; the development of a toll road from Gauteng to Maputo at a cost of about U\$\$400 million and a further U\$\$200 million invested in the railway line between Ressano Garcia and Maputo. Development corridors such as this support economic integration, anchor spatial development, help open up markets and promote increased trade and investment.

The Maputo Development Corridor stands out because it was driven by private sector frustration at the lack of infrastructure.

"A lot of things came together. There were clear mutual benefits to the two countries, to the private sector and to the governments," says Bingandadi.

"The increases in passenger and traffic flows across the borders are testament of the importance of this strategic corridor in regional integration and promoting sustainable economic development in the region," adds Barbara Mommen, chief executive officer of the Maputo Corridor Logistics Initiative (MCLI).

MCLI is the only private sector corridor management of its kind in Africa. Mommen notes that this private and public sector interface is a key factor in successfully addressing constraints on the Maputo Corridor.

"Without the private sector, the Maputo Corridor Concept wouldn't be so successful," acknowledges Nuno Maposse, Information and Marketing Services Coordinator for the Investment Promotion Centre of Mozambique.

"Most of the funds and resources have been sourced from the private sector based on the confidence they had. It's a very competitive business, it makes sense."

He says the corridor has had a major impact on Mozambique's economy. "We moved from about US\$300 million of exports 10 to 15 years ago to more than US\$2 billion now," says Maposse. He said the success of the corridor has impacted on activity at the Ressano Garcia/Lebombo border post between Mozambique and South Africa, which has expanded its capacity. "Now there is around 17 million tonnes of cargo coming in. The road has also been upgraded on the Mozambican side and traffic has increased dramatically." South African industry has also taken advantage: US\$2.25 billion worth of South African goods were exported through Mozambique in 2013, the bulk of which travelled through the Maputo Development Corridor. Future challenges, notes Mommen, include establishing a one-stop border post at Ressano Garcia/Lebombo, improving railway efficiency and promoting increased operational efficiency and growth.

All of this will contribute to an even smoother ride for business along the corridor, which now provides an alternative access to sea routes for landlocked countries such as Zambia or Zimbabwe.

It is common knowledge that not all girls who walk down the aisle are virgins and that not all wives out there are saints that they have not been known by other men


ekhona ubaba, naye anawo

hen you hear the term "assistance animal," you might think of guide dogs for blind and visually impaired people, but animals can be trained to perform a wide variety of tasks for their disabled partners, and the vast majority of assistance animals are dogs.

In fact, in America service animals are legally limited to dogs and trained miniature horses.

These animals help their partners achieve independence and play an important role in their lives


Ben is a type 1 diabetic who can't rely on an insulin pump and monitor to help him manage his condition because of adhesive allergies.

Wherever he goes – be it class, social events or the swimming pool - Dakota, his service dog is in tow. Dakota is a diabetic alert dog who can tell when Ben's blood sugar is too low or too high, and signals Ben to tell him to check his levels and take appropriate measures to get them under control.

Diabetic alert dogs can smell changes in blood sugar level. Dogs aren't the only animals that can do this.

There are cats that are equally capable of

noticing changes in blood sugar levels and signaling them to their human friends. Service dogs can also help people with epilepsy and other seizure conditions by detecting early warning signs of a seizure and alerting their handler.

Medication

They also fetch medication, press a button to summon assistance and "block," or physically obstruct their handlers so they don't accidentally fall down or enter a dangerous area (like the street).

Hearing dogs help deaf and hard-of-hearing people by alerting them to sounds such as the doorbell, the kettle, the alarm and other noises around the house.

Junior helps her partner Tanya by letting her know when the baby or another one of the children needs assistance, keeping an "ear," so to speak, on the kids so Tanya knows they're safe.

Handlers

Psychiatric service dogs help their handlers by performing a wide variety of tasks that help them manage their disabilities. These tasks are highly specialised, depending on the handler's needs; for example, a PTSD (post traumatic stress disorder – common among soldiers returning from war zones) dog might run through a home or room to "clear" it, checking for hazards, before her partner enters.

PTSD dogs can also guide medical responders to a handler in crisis, bring medications, or keep handlers centred by focusing on the dog instead of themselves when they're in a stressed state.

They remind handlers about medications and interrupt self-harming behaviors.

Mobility dogs can help stabilize people who have trouble walking independently, or pull wheelchairs for handlers.

Other assistance dogs fetch water bottles and other supplies on command, and can also perform tasks like turning lights on and off, opening doors, and more.

In all cases, service animals perform specific tasks to help a person with a disability, offering a service that the disabled person cannot perform independently.

They are working animals on the job, helping their owners retain independence and build confidence. The expansion of service animal handling and training to include a wide variety of disabilities in recent years has radically changed possibilities for disabled people. As working animals, they aren't the same as pets and cannot be treated in the same way; handlers with a service animal can't be refused service (for example at restaurants), although a business can choose to turn away pets.

Therapy dogs are not chosen for breed but for temperament and are often selected at shelters. It is a dog's environment and training that determine its personality and abilities. Training specialised dogs is an interesting career possibility.

ne of the worst nightmares for guests has been the experience of food poisoning after eating in a restaurant or some other hospitality facility.

The price you pay for not taking care of hygiene and cleanliness in your hospitality facility is very high. Restaurants with bad hygiene eventually get exposed and, given the speed at which news spread, their reputation is affected. To avoid such, it is wise to make certain preventive actions.

Contamination of food can happen at any point during its production: growing, harvesting, processing, storing, shipping or preparing. Foods like eggs, raw milk cooked or undercooked meat and poultry are usually associated with food pathogen, Salmonella. Salmonellosis is a type of food poisoning caused by the Salmonella enterica bacterium. Typical symptoms of infection are diarrhoea, abdominal cramps and fever. They appear 6 to 72 hours after eating contaminated food and last for three to seven days without treatment.

Cleaning and disinfecting

Restaurants must maintain a clean and hygienic environment for the health and safety of employees and patrons. Every aspect of the facility must be properly cleaned to ensure

safe food preparation and handling. Routine inspections of kitchen areas, eating and dining areas and restrooms must be carried out to ensure restaurant meets health and sanitation requirements set by the local government.

Kitchen Area

The kitchen is one of the most important areas in the restaurant to keep clean. This area is exposed to a variety of possible contaminants. Cooks, servers, bussers and even cashiers have access to the kitchen and could potentially contaminate food products. Uncooked food also poses health risks if surfaces are not cleaned sufficiently. Employees must sanitize equipment and surfaces that have come in contact with food and kitchen instruments and must do so after each task. SWASA has these standards SZNS SANS 10133:2011- Application of pesticides in food handling, food processing and catering establishments, SZNS SANS 10136:2007-Cleaning and disinfecting of dairy equipment and soft-serve dispensing units that address types of chemicals to be used in food establishments, as well as the proper storage techniques for food that might contain blood

borne pathogens. Kitchen items such as cutting boards, blenders, grills and countertops must be disinfected.

Dining Area

Dining and eating area cleanliness is necessary for safety reasons and to maintain the overall appearance of the establishment. The dining room is typically the first area patrons see when they enter a restaurant. Many visitors may decide to leave if the dining room appears unsanitary. Restaurant workers can clean dining areas by thoroughly sanitizing the surface areas customer's come in contact with, such as bar tops, table tops and chairs. Surface area cleaning should be done with clean towels that have not been used on surfaces in other areas of the restaurant. It is also necessary to ensure condiment bottles and menus are disinfected regularly.

Floors

Dirty restaurant floors are unsightly and pose a safety risk for restaurant employees and patrons. Many establishments place a large floor mat at the entrance of the restaurant to prevent outside dirt from being brought

inside. Workers must sweep and mop near the entrances and exits frequently as well as underneath booths and tables to keep these areas clean. Regular deep cleaning with soap, water and liquid bleach remove soil build up in tile grout. If a spill occurs, workers must promptly section off the area, clean up the spill and allow it to dry to avoid a slip-and-fall incident.

Restrooms

Restrooms are another area that require frequent cleaning and maintenance. Properly cleaning restrooms helps prevent cross-contamination from employees to food products and eating utensils. To clean the restroom, employees must scrub toilet bowls and seats, as well as the floor around the toilets. All door handles and sink faucets must be disinfected. Surface areas around sinks should be disinfected and dried. Dispensers for soap, paper towels and toilet paper should also be fully stocked. Employees should monitor restrooms frequently to ensure they do not require attention.

SWASA has the following standards SZNS SANS 10330:2007- HACCP, SZNS ISO TS 22002-1:2009 – Prerequisite programmes on food safety-Part 1: Food manufacturing, SZNS 22000:2005 – Food safety management systems and SZNS ISO 9001:2008 – Quality management systems to address the problems and risks inherent with the daily operations in the restaurant.

onsuming fruits and vegetables of all kinds has long been associated with a reduced risk of many lifestyle-related health conditions.

Many studies have suggested that increasing consumption of plant foods like watermelon decreases the risk of obesity and overall mortality, diabetes, heart disease and promotes a healthy complexion and hair, increased energy, overall lower weight.

Possible health benefits of watermelon

Asthma prevention: The risks for developing asthma are lower in people who consume a high amount of certain nutrients. One of these nutrients is vitamin C, found in many fruits and vegetables including watermelon.

Blood pressure: watermelon extract supplementation reduced ankle blood pressure, brachial blood pressure and carotid wave reflection in obese middle-aged adults with pre-hypertension or stage 1 hypertension and that watermelon extract improved arterial function.

Diets rich in lycopene may help protect against heart disease.

Cancer: As an excellent source of the strong antioxidant vitamin C as well as other antioxidants, watermelon can help combat the formation of free radicals known to cause cancer. Lycopene intake has been linked with a decreased risk of prostate cancer prevention in several studies.

Digestion and regularity: Watermelon, because of its water and fiber content, helps to prevent constipation and promote regularity for a healthy digestive tract.

Hydration: Made up of 92 percent water and full of important electrolytes, watermelon is a great snack to have on hand during the hot summer months to prevent dehydration.

Inflammation: Choline is a very important and versatile nutrient in watermelon that aids our bodies in sleep, muscle movement, learning and memory. Choline also helps to maintain the structure of cellular membranes, aids in the transmission of nerve impulses, assists in the absorption of fat and reduces chronic inflammation.


Muscle soreness: Watermelon and watermelon juice have been shown to reduce muscle soreness and improve recovery time following exercise in athletes. Researchers believe this is likely do to the amino acid L-citrulline contained in watermelon.

Skin: Watermelon is also great for your skin because it contains vitamin A, a nutrient required for sebum production that keeps hair moisturized. Vitamin A is also necessary for the growth of all bodily tissues, including skin and hair.

Adequate intake of vitamin C (one cup of watermelon provides 21% of daily needs) is also needed for the building and mainte-

nance of collagen, which provides structure to skin and hair. Watermelon also contributes to overall hydration, which is vital for having healthy looking skin and hair.

Watermelon facts that might surprise you

Watermelon juice may relieve muscle soreness. If you have a juicer, try juicing about one-third of a fresh watermelon and drinking its juice prior to your next workout. This contains a little over one gram of l-citrulline, an amino acid that seems to protect against muscle pain. One study found that men who drank natural unpasteurized watermelon juice prior to their workouts had reduced muscle soreness 24 hours later compared to those who drank a placebo. You do need to be careful with drinking watermelon juice, though, as it contains a significant amount of fructose. It may be better to eat the entire fruit, or opt for these other tips to prevent muscle soreness.

You can eat watermelon rind and seeds

Most people throw away the watermelon rind, but try putting it in a blender with some lime for a healthy, refreshing treat. Not only does the rind contain plenty of health-promoting and blood-building chlorophyll, but the rind actually contains more of the amino acid citrulline than the pink flesh. Citrulline is converted to arginine in your kidneys, and not only is this amino acid important for heart health and maintaining your immune system, but it has been researched to have potential therapeutic value in over a number of health conditions.

While many people prefer seedless watermelon varieties, black watermelon seeds are edible and actually quite healthy. They contain iron, zinc, protein, and fiber.

It's mostly water

This might not be surprising, but it is still a fun fact; watermelon is more than 91 percent water. This means that eating watermelon on a hot summer day is a tasty way to help you stay hydrated and avoid dehydration. However it is not a substitute for drinking plenty of fresh water,

Selection and storage

•Look the watermelon over. You are looking for a firm, symmetrical watermelon that is free from bruises, cuts or dents.

• Lift it up. The watermelon should be heavy for it's size. Watermelon is 92% water; most of the weight is water.

• Turn it over. The underside of the watermelon should have a creamy yellow spot from where it sat on the ground and ripened in the sun.

Store watermelon between 10-15°C, however 13°C is the ideal temperature. If watermelons are received refrigerated do not break the cold chain and store them in refrigeration. Watermelon will keep for 7-10 days at room temperature. After two days at 0°C, watermelons develop an off-flavor, become pitted and lose color. Freezing causes rind to break down and produces a mealy, mushy texture. Once a melon is cut, it should be wrapped and stored at 2°C.

Nutritive value

Nutritionists have long appreciated the health benefits watermelon provides.

Watermelon not only boosts your "health esteem," but it is has excellent levels of vitamins A and C and a good level of vitamin B6

Vitamin A found in watermelon is important for optimal eye health and boosts immunity by enhancing the infection-fighting actions of white blood cells called lymphocytes.

Vitamin B6 found in watermelon helps the immune system produce antibodies. Antibodies are needed to fight many diseases. Vitamin B6 helps maintain normal nerve function and form red blood cells. The body uses it to help break down proteins. The more protein you eat, the more vitamin B6 you need.

Vitamin C in watermelon can help to bolster the immune system's defenses against infections and viruses and can protect a body from harmful free radicals that can accelerate aging and conditions such as cataracts.

A two-cup serving of watermelon is also a source of potassium, a mineral necessary for water balance and found inside of every cell and people with low potassium levels can experience muscle cramps. The nutrients are very similar throughout the entire watermelon and not concentrated in the darker red center as some people believe. In fact, the white rind, which isn't normally eaten, has some of the highest nutrients concentrations. However, consume watermelon in moderation because it contains fructose, which may be harmful to your health in excessive amounts.



The latest batch of the Panama Papers, released by a group of investigative journalists, focuses on shell companies and corruption in Africa.

I have read their findings with great interest and noticed how this round of tax disclosures did not attract as much media interest as the first damning exposé.

This could, of course, be for several reasons, but one that was apparent — to me at least is a complacency or acceptance that Africa is wholly corrupt, an attitude that there is nothing we can do.

This is wrong. We must examine the root causes and do something to weed them out.

As the Panama Papers show, so much of the tax avoidance or criminal movement of finance on the continent is made possible by a system that is propped up by a number of banks, law firms and other outfits based outside Africa, working in collusion with African economic and political elites.

It is a system designed in the global north that helps Africa's few wealthy and powerful elites cheat the rest of us.

Tax abuse is a scourge on our global community, but especially for Africa. Our continent, which is blessed with vast arable land and other natural resources, is filled with families who go to bed hungry, ill and vulnerable people who die of preventable and curable diseases, and children who would love to be in school, but whose parents cannot afford the

Why don't all these people have these essential things many in the north have?

The governments that are meant to watch over all these people put their own interests first and fail to deliver vital services. They are comfortably in bed with big companies and wealthy individuals who are involved in the large-scale tax abuse that is facilitated —

some may say rigged — by the global north. This is so damaging for Africa. One in 12 African children die before their fifth birthday. About 34-million children are being deprived of primary school education; Africa has the world's lowest secondary school enrolment rates.

About 40-million young people are out of work on our continent. It is a tough time to be a young African.

Meanwhile, offshore companies connected to 44 of Africa's 54 countries appear in the Panama Papers.

Coincidence

Let there be no doubt that this is no coincidence. Yet we have reasons to be positive. Our continent, despite the challenges, is raising our best-educated generation yet.

With the right opportunities and investment in our youth, they could drive Africa's great potential, be it in the extractives industry, agriculture, finance and beyond.

By 2030, Africa could have tens of millions of new, stable, wage-paying jobs for these well-educated young adults. But for this to happen, economic growth has to be inclusive. Tax avoidance and evasion must stop.

Abuse

Governments around the world have been talking a lot lately about tax abuse, but it is mostly words and very little action.

Our current tax system is, frankly, bust Governments have to recognise this and the harm it does, and then rebuild it.

It just does not make sense to merely tinker with the engine of a burnt-out car.

African countries lose the most from tax dodging. African governments must therefore do more to push for a full reform of the global tax system, and demand action from countries such as the UK whose financial centres sit at the heart of the global network of tax havens.

They must do more to stamp out tax abuse and other forms of corruption at home.

The buck stops with our governments, as they represent the people who are losing out on basic needs. Politicians and government officials know this - they are people too and so I encourage them to say "no" to tax avoidance and evasion, and end financial

This is an urgent imperative.

DA councillor gunned down in Northern Cape

OHANNESBURG - A Democratic Alliance (DA) ward councillor in the Northern Cape was found murdered in the early hours of Thursday morning.

"Police can confirm that a case is being investigated in the murder of a 49-year-old man. A passenger he was travelling with sustained gun wounds and was taken to hospital. He is in a critical condition," Northern Cape police spokesperson, Brigadier Mariam Mochologi-Maleeme.

Mochologi-Maleeme said police are working around the clock in the investigation.

The DA in the province said it was shocked by the murder of Baadjies.

"It is suspected that his murder was politically motivated, as Baaitjies received death threats shortly after winning Ward 2 in Danielskuil on August 3, 2016, successfully wrestling it away from the ANC," said Andrew Louw, DA Northern Cape leader in a

The party said two DA councillors, together with the two councillors from the Kgatelopele Community Forum would form a coalition government and take control of the municipality from the ANC.

The DA said it will contest the upcoming by-election for ward 2, which was won by

"The DA extends our heartfelt condolences to Baaitjies' wife and three sons, as well as his extended family who he has sadly left behind. He will be sorely missed and it will not be easy finding someone of his capabilities to fill the gap that he has left," said Louw.

Free State man convicted on 933 child porn charges

OHANNESBURG - The South African Police Service (SAPS) yesterday said it 'welcomed Thursday's conviction by the Bloemfontein High Court of a Free State man for rape of and sexual assault on minors, possession, manufacturing and distribution of child pornography'

The SAPS said the 39-year-old man - whose full names cannot be disclosed in order to protect the identity of his victims - was arrested by a specially-assembled team of detectives from the police's Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences Unit in Gauteng. "He was first arrested in 2014 after the Canadian police managed to trace the IP address of someone sharing sexually explicit images of minors with other overseas-based paedophiles, to South Africa. The SAPS picked up the investigation and eventually managed to locate the suspect to an address in the Free State," said Brigadier Selvy Mohlala.

"Shocking details of how the suspect abused these minors emerged during the interviewing of the victims, two of whom are his own daughters. "He was found guilty on 933 charges levelled against him. These include conviction for 37 counts of rape, 18 counts of sexual assault, 541 counts of possession of child pomography, 108 counts of distribution of child pornography and 228 counts of manufacturing of child pomography," said Mohlala. ANCWL secretary-general Meokgo Matuba said in a statement: "The alleged paedophile has been reportedly luring girl learners into his cottage since 2012 to have sexual intercourse with them."

The illegal acts at Ekucabangeni High came to light when a video of the teacher allegedly having sex with one of his victims emerged. The legal age of con-

Southern Africa faces floods after drought

OHANNESBURG - UN agencies warned on Thursday that southern African countries were at risk of another year of food shortages as the drought-hit region is expected to be hit by above-average rainfall likely to trigger floods.

The region is still reeling from the effects of the El Nino weather phenomenon which devastated crops leaving some 18 million people in need of food aid, according to the World Food Programme.

Meteorologists forecast the region will this year experience more rainfall than normal due to an extreme weather pattern known as

"What La Nina brings is both good news and bad news," Lewis Hove, regional agricultural coordinator with the UN's Food and Agricultural Organisation told AFP.

The good news is that we are going to get above average rainfall, which normally means good production from our farmers,' said Hove.

"But above average rainfall is going to bring with it floods and water logging in some areas of the region," said Hove, speaking on the side lines of a meeting on droughtresilient agriculture in Johannesburg.


To ensure farmers benefit from the rains, the UN officials said they needed to plant early to avoid the floods.

But most farmers have little or no capital to buy farming inputs having been hit by two successive droughts.

Their governments will struggle to bail them out with cash for seeds and fertilisers.

Many of the regional economies are heavily dependent on commodities, prices for which have slumped on the international markets.

"If you look at Zambia, they lost something like 47 percent of their income because of the drop in copper (prices) so the capacity of government is weakened," Chris Nikoi, WFP southern African director told AFP. AFP

ACCRA - Ghana's President John Mahama said on Thursday that a maritime boundary dispute with Ivory Coast had affected the development of the new TEN oil field, but that Ghana was nonetheless committed to a peaceful resolution of the dispute. Mahama was speaking shortly after an opening ceremony for Ghana's second commercial crude oil field in the western city of Takoradi. The maritime boundary dispute had impacted TEN development activities in the disputed area as the provisional measures order from the international tribunal included an order prohibiting new oil wells in the field," Mahama said. 13 anti-slavery activists sentenced

NOUAKCHOTT – At least 13 antislavery activists in Mauritania were sentenced to between three and 15 years in prison on Thursday, despite criticism of the case against them by international rights groups. A court in the capital Nouakchott found the 13 – members of a group fighting hereditary slavery in the west African country – guilty of "use of violence," but Amnesty International has said they were falsely accused because of their advocacy work. *AFP*

ABUJA - Nigeria will need to combine monetary policies with fiscal and structural policies in order to overcome its worst economic crisis in decades and return to growth, President Muhammadu Buhari said on Thursday. Nigeria is in the middle of its worst crisis in decades as a slump in oil revenues hammers public finances and the naira. Gross domestic product shrank in the first quarter and the central bank governor has said a recession is likely. Reuters

Islamic suicide bombers kill 10

TRIPOLI - The Libyan army has suffered a military blow following several suicide bombings carried out by Islamic State (IS) militants in the city of Sirte, on the Mediterranean coast halfway between the capital Tripoli and the Eastern city of Benghazi. On Thursday the suicide bombers killed 10 Libyan soldiers and wounded a further 65, according to reports from Misrata Central Hospital.— African News Agency

South Sudan govt recruited child soldiers in past week

government has recruited child soldiers in the past week to prepare for a renewed conflict, according to an internal United Nations document obtained by The Associated Press.

The document says a senior politician appointed by President Salva Kiir led the recruitment of an entire village of boys using intimidation. Some were as young as 12 years old. It was not clear how many children were involved.

Armed groups in South Sudan often coerce children to join their ranks by threatening to confiscate their family's cattle, a key source of wealth and status in this pastoral society.

The UN document indicates that the recruitment of children took place shortly after the UN Security Council a week ago approved sending an additional 4 000 peace-keepers to the East African

Separately, UNICEF yesterday announced that at least 650 children have joined armed groups in South Sudan this year alone. Around 16 000 child soldiers have been recruited since civil war began in December 2013. Army spokesperson Lul Ruai Koang said youth who join the military are not forced. He said he was not aware of the recent recruitment of children.

South Sudan's military and opposition forces have made repeated promises to address allegations of child recruitment, but both sides have continued recruiting since July's outbreak of violence, according to Justin Forsyth, UNICEF's Deputy Executive Director.

"They believe they can easily control and manipulate young minds," Forsyth said. The children then "can commit atrocities, and they will do what they are told."

Child soldiers are defined as anyone recruited to join armed groups under the age of 18, and the International Criminal Court considers the recruitment of those under 15 to be a war crime. *AP*

Niger Delta militants threaten to withdraw from Nigeria

AGOS – The Niger Delta Avengers (NDA) militant group on Thursday threatened to pull the oil region out of Nigeria, accusing President Muhammadu Buhari of fuelling divisions in the country.

"The Buhari-led government has failed Nigerians with their misdirected policies that have divided the country, as such nobody wants to be part of that failed state not even the Niger Delta," the NDA said in a statement.

Since the start of the year, the Avengers have carried out a string of devastating attacks on Nigeria's oil pipelines and facilities

The oil rebels said the Niger Delta, home to the country's multi-billion-dollar oil and gas resources might declare an independence on October 1.

"The October 1st declaration of independence is still sacrosanct. If the Nigerian government fails to retrace its step by restructuring this country," it warned.

Nigeria marks October 1st as the anniversary of its political independence from colonial power Britain in 1960.

The Avengers said they wished that northern Nigeria could also strike crude oil.

"Our prayer for Buhari and the northern hypocrite (northern governors) is that oil should be found in commercial quantity in the north, so they can let the Niger Delta go," it added. *AFP*

Morocco cleric blasts 'nudity' among immodestly dressed women

ABAT - A senior
Moroccan cleric has
lashed out at what he
called "nudity" in the Muslim
kingdom, claiming that more
and more women are immodestly dressed, sparking criticism in the media.

Morocco is seen as promoting a more tolerant form of Islam than some Arab countries, and women in cities and towns often eschew the Islamic veil in public. While the countryside is somewhat more conservative, attitudes to female dress vary according to local social and cultural customs and in the cities many women don Western-style clothes.

Omar al-Kazabri, imam of Casablanca's Hassan II mosque, Morocco's largest house of worship, said there is a growing trend among women across the country to go about "unclothed".

"Nudity is no longer confirmed to season, it is spreading before our eyes in winter and summer," he said on his official Facebook page earlier this week. "Look at the streets. It breaks your heart to see the situation we find ourselves in. Obscene nudity [is an] affront to God's commandments, an insult and an outrage to the population," he wrote. *AFP*

Kaunda congratulates Zambian president

USAKA – Former Zambian leader Kenneth Kaunda has congratulated President Edgar Lungu following his victory in the presidential elections.

Zambia held its elections on August 11.

Speaking at the State House on Wednesday

Kaunda said: "Through the outcome of the vote,
the people of Zambia continue to exhibit their
trust in the president and his work."

Kaunda, according to Lusaka Times, praised Lungu for upholding the motto, 'One Zambia, One Nation', in order to promote development and unity.

Reports indicated that Lungu received 1 860 877 votes while his rival, Hakainde Hichelema of the the opposition United Party for National Development (UPND) received 1 760 347.

For the first time, the winner needed over 50% of the votes to avoid a run-off election.

The elections were tainted with street clashes followed by allegations of irregularities from the opposition. The Post reported on Thursday that the opposition had warned Zambians to brace for misery and chaos as the UPND prepared to fight the election results in court.

The UPND, along with the Movement for Multi-Party Democracy (MMD), accused Lungu of being a self-ordained emperor, The Post reported.

"Edgar Lungu's history since he came on the political scene brought a terrible taste in the mouth of any democrat. His regime is well known for its love for illegalities, disrespect for the rule of law and disregard for anything that is civil and legal," MMD leader Nevers Mumba was quoted as saying. News24

French president feels 'urge' to run again in 2017

ARIS - French President Francois Hollande says he may run in next year's elections provided he sees a chance of winning, but would quit politics if he lost, according to a book published yesterday.

Ouoted by journalists Antonin Andre and Karim Rissouli in 'Conversations Privees avec le president' (Private Conversations with the president, Hollande highlighted the strain of politics, the burden of high office and the passing of time.

"I know what it's like ... to spend years without a personal life," he said.

"But I do have the desire to stand for re-election," he said. "That is my personal inclination." He added, though: "I would not make the choice of putting my name forward if the signs are that it could not lead to a possibility of

"If I lost, I would quit politics." The president celebrated his 62nd birthday on August 12.

"When you get beyond 60, the years have a different value. I also know what the weight of the (presidential) task is. It's true, it could also be a kind of freedom

apparently musing out loud.

Separately, in remarks that the journalists dated to November 2013, Hollande said of the presidency, "It's tough, of course it's tough. Much tougher than I had imagined.'

Hollande is struggling with a historic low in popularity, driven by France's high unemployment rate but also coinciding with terror attacks that have shaken the country.

Hollande argued that his response to the jihadist assaults had reassured many members of the public about his leadership, according to the book.

During the attacks, "in the eyes of many people, I became president," he said.

Hollande was elected president in 2012, becoming the Socialist Party's challenger after its perceived front runner, Dominique

Strauss-Kahn, became embroiled in a sex scandal.

The country has two major elections next year, for the presidency, unfolding in two rounds on April 23 and May 7, and for the National Assembly, on June 11 and June 18.

Hollande has previously said he will not stand for re-election unless he makes a "credible" dent in France's unemployment rate.

On Thursday, the statistics bureau Insee said joblessness in mainland France in the second quarter of 2016 had fallen to 9.6 percent of the workforce.

This was the first time it had dropped below 10 percent since the third quarter of 2012.

According to an opinion poll published on August 4 by survey group Elabe, only 17 percent of electors say they trust Hollande to resolve the country's problems.

T. Rowe Price sues Valeant

UNITED STATES - T. Rowe Price Group Inc. has sued Valeant Pharmaceuticals International Inc. alleging that investors in the Canadian drug maker lost billions of dollars as a result of the company's "fraudulent scheme". Valeant's US-listed shares reversed course to close down 3.4 percent at \$37.19 on Thursday. They had risen as much as five percent, after the company's lenders agreed to an amendment to loosen covenants on its \$31 billion of debt.T. Rowe Price, one of the biggest investment managers in the world, said Valeant had used a secret pharmacy network, deceptive pricing and reimbursement practices, and fictitious accounting to shield the company's branded drugs from generic competition and artificially inflate revenues and profits.

Trump ready to tone down tough talk

NORTH CAROLINA - Donald Trump expressed regret on Thursday for remarks that "may have caused personal pain" as he sought to refocus his message in the face of falling opinion poll numbers in his first speech since a shake-up in his campaign this week. "Sometimes, in the heat of debate and speaking on a multitude of issues, you don't choose the right words or you say the wrong thing," the Republican presidential nominee told a crowd in Charlotte, North Carolina. iol

Minister calls for partial burga ban

BERLIN - German Interior Minister Thomas de Maiziere came out yesterday

in favour of a partial burga ban amid a fierce national debate on integration. "We agree that we reject the



burqa, we agree that we want to introduce a legal requirement to show one's face in places where it is necessary for our society's coexistence - at the wheel, at public offices, at the registry office, in schools and universities, in the civil service, in court," he said after a meeting with regional counterparts from his conservative party. AFP

15 Thai tourist blasts suspects

THAILAND - "Authorities have detained 17 suspects at the special 11th Army Circle barracks in Bangkok but we had released two of them," Colonel Burin Tongprapai, the junta's top legal advisor, told reporters. Colonel Burin said authorities were looking to re-detain the two suspects who were released and that the entire group were likely to be charged yesterday. AFP

7 Chicago cops face dismissal

CHICAGO - Chicago's police chief said on Thursday he was recommending the firing of seven officers accused of making false reports in the deadly shooting of a black teenager. A video of 17-year-old Laquan McDonald's 2014 shooting death sparked outrage and was one of several police shootings of African Americans that spurred street protests around the country. Superintendent Eddie Johnson's decision to relieve the officers followed a review of documents, video and other evidence, his office said. AFP

Obama administration to end use of private prisons

7ASHINGTON - The Justice Department says it's phasing out its relationships with private prisons after a recent audit found the private facilities have more safety and security problems than ones run by the government.

Deputy Attorney General Sally Yates has instructed federal officials to significantly reduce reliance on private prisons.

As of December 2015, more than 22 000 federal inmates - or about 12% of the total were in private facilities. That's according to a report this month from the Justice Department's inspector general.

The government began to rely on private prisons in the late 1990s due to overcrowd-

In her memo on Thursday, Yates says the decline in the prison population over the past three years contributes to the decision not to renew private prison contracts.

Mexico police kill 22 civilians in drug raid

EXICO CITY -Mexican police massacred 22 civilians in arbitrary executions during a raid on a drug gang last year, a human rights ombudsman said on Thursday.

The bloodbath happened in a raid by federal police against the Jalisco Nueva Generacion cartel in the western state of Michoacan on May 22, 2015.

It was one of the bloodiest battles in the Mexican government's

decade-long campaign against powerful drug gangs.

Officers committed "violations of the right to life by excessive use of force that entailed the arbitrary execution of 22 civilians," the country's National Human Rights Commission said.

They also committed "aggravated acts of torture on two people who were detained," commission chief Ismael Eslava said, reading from the report. AFP

Naked Trump leaves NY in giggles

TEW YORK - A naked Angeles, San Francisco, Seattle statue of Donald Trump, complete with bulging belly and elaborate yellow hair, caused laughter and merriment in New York on Thursday until it was demolished by park wardens.

Hands clasped across ample belly, the sculpture was unveiled in Union Square, gazing out across a busy street with an engraved plaque saying 'The Emperor Has No Balls,' witnesses said.

Four other naked Trump statues appeared on Thursday in Los

and Ohio, according to social media posts. Indecline, a California-based company, released a video on its website showing naked statues of the controversial Republican presidential nominee being made.



Bangladesh sack coach Kalpage for no-show

HAKA - Bangladesh cricket authorities yesterday said they have sacked the national team's assistant coach Ruwan Kalpage after he failed to report for

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) had asked Sri Lankan Kalpage to join the nation-

al team's conditioning camp by August 16 ahead of a home series against England.

"We set a deadline for him to join, but he did not respond," BCB chief executive officer Nizamuddin Chowdhury said.

"Therefore we decided to terminate his contract," Chowdhury said. Kalpage had

reportedly expressed concerns over his safety in Bangladesh following an attack by Islamist extremists on a Dhaka cafe last month that left 22 people, mostly foreigners, dead.

The country has been reeling from months of gruesome killings of religious minoriti and secular activists, with many of the attacks claimed by the Islamic State (IS)

Two other Sri Lankans - head coach Chandika Hathurusinghe and fitness trainer Mario Villavarayan - as well as Zimbabwean fielding coach Richard Halsall have already joined the camp, after the BCB provided them with armed security guards.

Kalpage joined Bangladesh as assistant coach on a two-year contract in August 2014 and was earlier this year given an extension until the 2019 World Cup.

Mark Boucher is new Titans coach

OHANNESBURG-Mark Boucher, the heartbeat of the South African team from the late 1990s to 2012, is hoping the experience and wisdom gained from all those years of playing and inspiring the changeroom will rub off on his new career as coach, with the 39year-old set to land the job as the new Titans mentor.

Boucher's stellar career, in which he played 147 Tests and 295 one-day internationals, and took the most dismissals in Test history, was ended on the 2012 tour of England when he suffered a serious eye injury after being hit by a bail in a warm-up game.

another chapter of improbable Olympic history with a third consecutive 200m crown on Thursday as Ashton Eaton led an American gold rush by clinching backto-back decathlon titles.

Bolt, who just days earlier had become the first man in history to win three 100m titles in a row, surged to victory in the 200m in 19.78 at the Olympic Stadium.

Canada's Andre De Grasse took silver in 20.02, just ahead of France's Christophe Lemaitre, who nicked bronze in 20.12.

Bolt's triumph was greeted with rapturous applause by Brazilian fans who roared their appreciation as the sprint superstar set off on a lap of honour, with Bob Marley booming from stadium speakers.

The win left the 29-year-old Bolt just one win away from his targeted "triple triple" - a repeat of his sweep of 100m, 200m and 4x100m golds at the 2008 and 2012 Games.

"No, I can't grasp what I've achieved, definitely not," said Bolt. "You work so hard for years and then you just hope it pays off. It is a brilliant feeling.

"I'm getting older and my body is ageing. Personally I think this is my last 200 but my coach may beg to differ."

Bolt will attempt to put the seal on what he says is his final Olympics in today's 4x100m

Bolt's win came on a day when US athletes snapped up four more golds with wins in decathlon, men's and women's 400m hurdles and shot put.

Eaton, the defending decathlon champion and world record holder, overcame a fierce chal-



lenge from France's Kevin Mayer to win the punishing 10-event discipline with a total of 8 893 points.

Mayer won silver with a total of 8 834, with Canada's Damian Warner taking bronze.

Eaton's back-to-back titles matched Britain's Daley Thompson, who won gold in the event in the 1980 and 1984 Olympics.

"To win two Olympic golds in a row like Daley Thompson is very special," Eaton said.

"One day, I'm going to have to meet Daley, shake his hand and thank him for giving me something to chase after.'

US SWIMMERS LEAVE BRAZIL AFTER ADMITTING TO INVENTING MUGGING

IO DE JANEIRO - US Olympic authorities apologised to Brazil on Thursday as two US swimmers were allowed to go home having retracted a fabricated story about being mugged in Rio.

A third American swimmer who is still in Brazil can leave the country after he paid a donation to an "institution" of nearly \$11 000, US broadcaster NBC reported his lawyer as saying yesterday.

Four US swimmers, including six gold medal hero Ryan Lochte, have been at the centre of a media storm since claiming they were held up at gunpoint after leaving a party in the early hours of Sunday.

"We apologize to our hosts in Rio and the people of Brazil for this distracting ordeal in the midst of what should rightly be a celebration of excellence," US Olympic Committee CEO Scott Blackmun said in a statement.

Blackmun spoke after Brazilian police let Gunnar Bentz and Jack Conger leave the

country. "Their passports have been released and they recently departed Rio," he said.

A third swimmer, James Feigen, gave police a "revised statement," Blackmun said.

He agreed to a deal in which he would make a hefty donation to an unspecified group in exchange for permission to leave, NBC said.

Deliberation

"After a long deliberation, this agreement was reached... he will donate 35 000 real (\$10 800) to an institute, and with that the case is resolved," the broadcaster cited Feigen's lawyer Breno Melaragno as saying.

"After this donation is done, his passport will be given back to him, and he will be free to return home."

Lochte was already back in the United States when the scandal erupted.

Lochte said on Sunday that the four had been victims of a robbery by at least one armed assailant posing as a Rio policeman.

SEMENYA BLOCKING OUT CRITICS

IO DE JANEIRO - South Africa's Caster Semenya said on Thursday she has blocked out the controversy surrounding her bid for Olympic gold after powering into the 800m final.

The 25-year-old continues to divide opinion in the athletics world because of her condition, hyperandrogenism, which causes elevated testosterone

Some rivals have called for authorities to revisit rules aimed at setting limits for testosterone, claiming Semenya's rare physiology gives her an unfair advantage.

But a sports court last year tossed out an International Association of Athletics Federations rule aimed at curbing her advantage, allowing Semenya to dominate her event.

It has left Semenya the heavy favourite to take gold in Rio, a victory certain to cause controversy in some

Semenya however shrugged off the controversy on Thursday after producing a late surge over the final 200 metres to advance from her semifinals 1:58.15 at the Olympic Stadium ahead of Britain's Lynsey Sharp.

"I'm not focused on people, just on my race," Semenya replied when

asked about her critics.

"At the end of the day it's not about people, it's about you - it's you up against the world."

Semenya's form this year has fuelled speculation that Jarmila Kratochvilova's 33-year-old world record could be in jeopardy at

Saturday's final.

However Semenya said she is not thinking about a new world best.

"I'm not focusing on the world record. The focus is to go home with the gold medal," she said.

In the other semi-finals on Thursday, Poland's Joanna Jozwik

> won her semi in 1:58.93 ahead of 2015 World Championship silver medallist Melissa Bishop of Canada, second in 1:59.05.

Kenya's Margaret Wambui and Francine Niyonsaba grabbed the automatic qualifying spots from the first semi.

"It was a bit tough but I told myself to put in a bit more effort than yesterday and I just relaxed," said Wambui.

"I wanted to make sure I was in a position to qualify for the final," the Kenyan added. AFP

Viljoen SA's first female medallist

IO DE JANEIRO -Sunette Viljoen is Team South Africa's first female medallist at the Rio Olympics after winning silver in Thursday night's (Friday morning, SA time) javelin.

It takes the total medal tally to NINE for SA, but the first eight of those were all won by men or men's teams.

Ironically, South Africa's last medal hope at the Games is likely to be another female athlete in the form of Caster Semenya in Saturday's (Sunday morning, SA time) 800m final.

"Baie lekker," was Viljoen's response when asked how she felt being Team SA's first female medallist in Rio.

"That makes it so much more special. To be the first one ... I didn't even know that. But it's good."

Viljoen then challenged female athletes in South Africa to show more character.

"I think we need just more of



the women to come through," she said.

"Sometimes they give up so easily when the going gets tough but that's when you have to dig deep. That's what I'm very proud of. I think after London I just kept fighting."

Viljoen finished fourth at the London Olympic four years ago.

ONDON - Steven Pienaar has put pen to paper on a one-year deal with English Premier League outfit, Sunderland, despite speculation about a potential return to the PSL.


The 34-year-old left EPL club Everton after his contract came to an end on June, 30, and the next step in the player's career was the subject of much speculation, both locally and abroad.

Wenger bemoans English Premier League transfer market

ONDON - The Arsenal boss, who is a notoriously reluctant spender, much to the chagrin of the club's supporters, says prices for players are being inflated as much as 10 times for teams in England Wenger is in desperate need of a centre-back as well as a striker with both Valencia defender Shkodran Mustafi and Lyon forward Alexandre Lacazette reportedly close to joining the club, although with these concerns, the pair may just be another in a long line of transfer targets the club has allowed to get away.

Reports suggest Valencia have raised their asking price for Mustafi from £15 million to £30m with Lyon turning down a £30.9m bid for Lacazette as they seek compensation closer to £60m.

Wenger told the Telegraph: "Today in Europe you have two markets. One for the English clubs and one for the rest of Europe.

"The danger of the English situation is that the English clubs can suffocate themselves in the long term. Why?

Because they buy players at a very high price. That means there are very high wages linked with it and, if they are wrong, they will have these players with high wages who cannot move anywhere else."

Wenger added:
"I have told you before the criteria for the price of a player but you could add one more: the identity of the buyer.

"When the buyer is English, it is true that it multiplies the transfer by two or three or sometimes by 10. If an English club does not come in, he is worth £5m but, if an English club comes for the same player, he is worth £35m or 40 or 50."

Auditing firm Deloitte confirmed in the Telegraph that Premier League clubs have already spent £800m, and with the transfer window still open, that figure is expected to rise to £1



E30000 FINE FOR MISBEHAVING TEAMS

SOCCER – Teams found guilty of causing abandonment of a game during the Castle Premier Challenge will be fined not less than E30 000.

This is according to the rules and regulations of the tournament released by Management Committee (MC) Secretary John Mazibuko on Thursday.

Article 5(6) of the rule states that a club that abandons or causes abandonment of a game or refuses to take to the field of play shall lose the match to the opposing club and be further subjected to a disciplinary action and liable to a fine.

Teams also found guilty of unsporting behaviour during the games will also be fined a maximum fine of E30 000.

Article 10 states that any club whose member, official, players or supporters enegage in unsporting or violent misconduct either before, during or after a match shall be liable to punishment. Throwing missiles of any kind into the field of play

carries a minimum fine of E10 000 as well as threatening by conduct, words, assault if attempt to assault a referee, PLS official and an opposing club's player.

The rules further state that a player or official positively identified by referees or match commissioners or PLS officials to have contravened any section of this article shall be liable to suspension as provided for in the National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) rules if found guilty.

This is contained in Article 7 3(a) (ii) of the rules which states that in the case of the draw during the 90 minutes regulation time, the game shall continue to extra time of 30 minutes. The rules also state

that in the case of the draw in the extra time, the game shall proceed to penalty shoot-outs in terms of the Laws of the Game and where applicable to death penalties.

Previous

As in previous tournaments, the semi-finals of the tournament will be played on a home and away knockout format. The team which shall have scored the higher aggregate number of goals in the two matches shall qualify for the finals. The semi-finals of the E1.13 million sponsored tournament have has been slated for September 6 and 11, respectively while the finals will take centre on the 25th at a venue still to be confirmed.

ongoing because they couldn't agree on the transfer fee," said the source.


The source added that Leopard are said to have asked for a reduced transfer fee and in addition offered to loan the team two players.



Paul Pogba, making his second United debut, looked very bright in a first half in which his side hadn't had things all their way.
