



TOURISTS' BUS CRASHES AT NKOMANZ

A tourists' tour bus from Mega Coach company, was involved in a freak accident yesterday afternoon at Matitila, an area found in Nkomanzi.

The bus that carried only the luggage of the tourists veered off the road and hit a cliff, landing on its side on a road.

The bus was coming from Mantenga Cultural Village in Ezulwini, where the tourists from South Africa had been touring.

July Khoza (53), a South African driver, said the bus had no problem when they departed from Mantenga.

The bus was headed for Matsamo Border Post, on its way to South Africa.

The tourists passed Mbabane having no problem at all until they reached Nkomanzi.

"That is when we started to have a problem where the bus was having a diesel cut. It became difficult for it to move up the slope after we had crossed the Nkomanzi River," Khoza said. The bus was still loaded with the tourists when it started developing mechanical problems.

As it moved up the slope towards the Pigg's Peak direction, it became clear to the driver that it would be very difficult for him and the tourists to proceed with the journey on the bus.

Luckily for him, another tour bus from another company found them stranded on the road.

"I personally know the driver of the other bus, so I asked him to take my tourists with him to Matsamo while I waited for another bus from Mega Coach to take the luggage from the bus I was driving and proceed with the tourists for whom I was driving," he said.

Khoza said he was then helped by a certain lady from the area who gave him a cellphone to call the other bus from Mega Coach. He was also able

It then reversed all by itself from where it had parked. It almost fell off a ditch, but it is said to have been prevented by the Ford Focus. This led to the bus to hit the cliff and finally

MMM members finally admit defeat

SWAZI members of MMM
RSA, the online ponzi
scheme which took
Swaziland and the rest of
Southern Africa by storm in
2015 through to early 2016
have finally admitted defeat.
MMM RSA members have
been in the past months causing an uproar over media
reports that were warning people to refrain from joining the
online ponzi
scheme which

promised its
members a 35%
profit after a period of two weeks.
Since its inception in Southern Adv.

tion in Southern Africa, MMM loyal members have always defended Mavrodi, the founder of the ponzi scheme saying he was trying to end poverty, not defraud them.

The ponzi scheme was popular among the civil servants, especially teachers and nurses. One former member who wanted to remain anonymous revealed that though she gained lots of money from MMM, she also lost a sizeable amount of money.

"I first started donating E500 and gradually I increased my donation as I gained the trust that it was not a fly-by-night pyramid scheme like the ones I had witnessed through the years. Little did I know that it will soon cease to operate," she said. In May, reports that the ponzi scheme had collapsed and frozen all accounts, shook the MMM community, but

members stayed put and believed a press statement sent by MMM administration that the freezing of the Mavros (MMM currency) was due to congestion in their system. Seeing sceptic Swazi clientele withdrawing from the ponzi scheme after the news of the collapse, MMM representatives from Rustenburg, South Africa, came into the country in a bid to assure the MMM community that the ponzi scheme was not collapsing as international and local media

had reported. During the presentation, MMM Guider Mpho Molokoane advised the

meeting's attendants that they should join the scheme with extra money they had. The MMM representative minced no words as he told eager Swazis there was no guarantee that once they 'donate' to the scheme, they would get it back. She said this was because there were no guarantees that the money would be repaid back to the individuals who had 'donated'.

She emphasised that donating was not an investment, saying it was a community of people helping one another. Molokoane advised the local MMM community members to turn a blind eye to the media's negative reports about the scheme. She further encouraged them to graduate from donating a few hundreds but to start thinking of 'injecting' thousands of Emalangeni to yield more.

El Nino forcing children into child labour

A report from World Vision has revealed that El Nino is having a devastating impact on children in the Southern Africa region forcing them into early marriage, child labour and out of school.

The report based on expert insight from Swaziland and eight other countries in the region, found that El Nino was severely impacting the lives of children and their futures.

Although El Nino as a climatic phenomenon is now over food insecurity has yet to peak, putting 49 million people at risk.

The report's findings found that El Nino's impacts were worsening the lives of children in a number of areas with more migrating out of impoverished areas, facing separation, hunger, sexual exploitation, violence, child labour and psychosocial distress.

Nearly 80 percent of experts questioned said school drop-outs had increased largely due to lack of food.

Globally, \$3.9 billion has been requested for the 19 worst affected countries, yet the current funding gap is almost \$2.5 billion. The United Nations' Children Fund (UNICEF) estimates that 26 million children across Eastern and Southern Africa are at risk from malnutrition, water shortages and disease.

"It seems that in disasters like this, children come last," said Rudo Kwaramba, World Vision Regional Leader in Southern Africa. The report, Regional Child Protection Rapid Assessment, was designed to explore the various ways children are impacted by a slow-onset emergency, like El Nino.

"I did not want to marry. I wanted to study," said a young girl in Mozambique who at age 14, was forced to marry a man many years older, after her family ran out of food. When her husband started beating

her, she ran away.

Of the multi-billions of dollars needed for a comprehensive response only \$11.7m is needed for Child Protection interventions. However, only six percent of this amount has been pledged by donors, making it the most under-funded sector in the response.

"We think of food and water as the most important things, without them we cannot live, but being forced out of school and into work or marriage at a young age ends the lives of children in a different way," said Kwaramba.

The report is the outcome of an assessment of children's protection issues in South Africa, Lesotho, Swaziland, Angola, Mozambique, Malawi, Zimbabwe, Zambia and the Democratic Republic of Congo. It was conducted by World Vision, PLAN International and UNICEF who interviewed child protection experts on what they were seeing happening to children.

ALBINO WOMAN'S HAND CHOPPED OFF

MALAWI - A woman living with albinism has been attacked by unknown assailants in Malawi's Chipita District, Nyasa Times reports.

The victim, identified as 51year-old Lucia Kainga, was targeted in the early hours of Saturday morning when the attackers, armed with machetes and sticks, attempted to decapitate her and chop off her hands.

Yohane Mfungwe, Lucia's husband, claimed that the assailants entered the couple's home at approximately 02:00, after they opened their front door to assist someone they had heard crying for help outside.

"Someone was crying for help at the door of our house. It was when I opened the door to find out what was going on, when I landed in the hands of the four men who attacked both of us," the distraught man was quoted as saying.

Lucia was rushed to a nearby medical facility soon after the attack. She lost her right hand.

The attack was the first of its kind in the Chipita District, which recently saw a grave exhumed in search of albino remains to sell on the black market. Fuelled by a belief that albino body parts bring wealth, attacks on albinos have increased in recent times, leading to the deaths of at least 17 albino nationals in the last two years.

Bumper pay finally arrives

EXCITEMENT is buzzing in all civil servants quarters as the much awaited bumper pay dubbed 'dvuladvula' has finally arrived.

Civil servants started receiving their bumper pay yesterday. Pay dates for civil servants vary by ministry and also on the banks they use for their salaries. The judiciary and a few other ministries usually get their pay on the 19th, teachers receive theirs between the 20th and the 21th, the police service on the 22th, the army on the 24th and correctional service employees on the 23th.

One excited civil servant said he has already received his bumper pay but was still waiting to receive his pay slip to ensure that everything tallies accordingly.

"The pay slip will explain a lot of

things, as for now I cannot comment much as I still have to see how much Pay As You Earn has been deducted, but all in all I am happy that I have finally received it," said the civil servant.

Excitement

The bumper pay, which is causing much excitement to the civil servants, is offering a pay increase of 17% up to 64 %, which will be backdated to April 1, 2016.

Two weeks ago the Joint Negotiation Forum (JNF) which consisted of the Government Negotiation Team (GNT) and the public sector unions, reached a consensus and signed an agreement for effecting the salary review July end.

Unions

The public sector unions included the Swaziland National Association of Government Accounts Personnel (SNAGAP), Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU), Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) and National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU).

It is worth noting that civil ser-

vants have not had a salary review for the past 12 years. The public sector unions started the process of negotiating for a salary review in 2013 where government contracted a private consultancy company, LCC Capital to come up with the suitable pay structures that would be effected for the civil servants.

In September 2015, LCC Capital submitted the report but it took the ministry of public service over four months to finally release the salary review report which had recommendations to the unions.

19 PRINCIPALS PAY E500 000 TO FAKE AUDITORS

Police have already arrested two men who include a former auditor employed by govt

A former auditor has been arrested together with another man for allegedly extorting money amounting to E500 000 from 19 schools around the country.

It is alleged that the two went around mainly in primary schools posing as auditors who were however, willing to help principals conceal any form of rot in their operations.

The money was largely for that exercise. They allegedly swindled susceptible school heads money in return of covering up certain irregularities in their respective schools' financial books. It is alleged that equipped with information about the procedure of auditing, the former auditor employed his know-how as the two went around extorting headteachers money.

Information gathered is that the former auditor was fired from his place of work in 2013 for malpractice.

Some of the schools which are alleged to have fallen prey to the bogus auditors include St Paul's Primary and Salesian Primary. During a visit yesterday to St Paul's the principal was 'out' of office, however, the deputy of the school was reluctant on giving out information.

He could neither deny nor confirm such reports.

At Salesian Primary, the principal admitted that indeed the bogus auditors paid the school a visit.

When asked if she paid them any money, the principal stated that the matter was now being handled by the police and she was advised not to talk about it to the media or to anyone as that would jeopardise the investigations.

Allegations are that the bogus auditors made away with E40 000 from the two primary schools as they managed to allegedly extort E20 000 from each school.

Information gathered is that the two not only paid a 'visit' to Salesian and St Paul's Primary but they also visited about 17 other schools where they extorted money ranging from E20 000 to E35 000.

THE St Paul's Primary School principal whom it is alleged paid E20 000 to the bogus auditors hid his identity from our news crew when visited at the school yesterday.

A receptionist at the administration block who was asked if the principal was around responded to the affirmative and stated that indeed the principal was in his office.

The principal's office is adjacent to that of the lady found at the reception. When this reporter introduced himself to the principal who was with his deputy according to descriptions of the two given by the St Paul's schools manager later on, he stated that he is not the principal but is the deputy as the principal was away in town to buy tools to be used for agriculture.

When the principal's cellphone number was requested the man declined saying it is something personal and therefore he could not give it to strangers.

However, when the schools manager for St Paul's was called later on the day about the matter he said he had spoken with the principal and he admitted having seen this reporter who visited the school.

The schools manager said the principal also told him the same thing that he did not know anything about the dubious auditors who visited the school.

The schools manager when told that the deputy said the principal was not around, he was shocked and failed to understand why the principal would tell such a lie.

The manager said he can only hope that the principal is not involved in such a mess. The manager stated that he got hold of the head teacher through the phone as when he went to his office he was told a different story that the head teacher was not feeling well as opposed to going to town to buy tools.

Suicide suspected in deadly collision

A female motorist is suspected to have committed suicide by driving at a high speed into a Feed Master truck.

The female motorist, who was driving a VW Amarok vehicle, died on the spot after crashing her car into the truck.

According to Felix Dlamini who was found at the scene, he got a distress call from his driver (truck) after he was involved in the shocking accident.

Dlamini said the driver told him that a vehicle which was coming from the direction of Mafutseni drove straight towards his truck at a very high speed and showed no signs of slowing down It is said the truck driver, at first, thought that the Amarok driver was just playing games but when he realised that the vehicle wasn't swerving back to its lane, he stopped his truck but it was too late as the van went straight under it.

Impact

Due to the severe impact, part of the truck burst into flames.

Mphiwa Dlamini from the Fire Department stated that when they arrived at the scene they found the vehicle stuck under the truck and due to oil spillages the truck was already catching fire.

The prompt response from the Fire Service Department saved the truck from being engulfed by flames. The truck driver was taken to Raleigh Fitkin Memorial Hospital.

Schools manager aware of matter

MACANJANA Motsa, the Ministry of Education and Training Under Secretary (Schools Manager) said she was aware of the case as she got wind of it from the auditor general's office.

Motsa said she heard that there were certain people going around schools posing as auditors.

She said there was no situation which requires principals to give cash to auditors; but conceded such can only happen when one knows that he or she is in the wrong hence the reason to bribe an audit officer.

Motsa said even though she does not know the exact procedure of auditing, she is aware that in such incidents where by people require money when doing audits, it is every principal's duty to be whistle blowers.

Motsa condemned such actions saying principals cannot just give

money to people unless 'bayaganga'. Swaziland Principals Association (SWAPA) Deputy President Welcome Mhlanga said in June SWAPA had a workshop with the auditor general's office and various stakeholders where they touched base on such issues.

Mhlanga stated that even though not every principal was there but generally it is known that when government does audits, it is free of charge unless one has hired a private auditor.

An officer from the AG's office who spoke on condition of anonymity stated that they always tell teachers that there is no money required for auditing and they are well aware of that.

Numerous attempts to get hold of the Auditor General Phestecia Nxumalo failed as her phone rang unanswered for the better part of the day.

Mamba stated that police were still continuing with investigations and the two suspects were expected to make their first court appearance at the Magistrate's Court.



member of the portfolio committee on health. Zwane, however, pleaded innocence on the matter.

When the senators were asked who allocates the external trips, they pointed at Zwane, arguing it was her responsibility to ensure fairness prevailed.

Ideally, the aggrieved senators emphasised, that the chairpersons of the various portfolio committees were supposed to assign members on a rotational basis.

At the ongoing HIV and AIDS Conference in Durban, the House of Assembly is represented by Somntongo MP Sandile Nxumalo, a chairperson of the chamber's HIV and AIDS Committee.

"In our case, Bonsile is neither a member of the HIV and AIDS Committee nor the Health Committee. This is clearly an indication that there is a serious lack of leadership in our chamber. Gelane does that all by herself," said a senator. The senators asked to speak anonymously because they have yet to raise the matter with

Sessional Committee Chairman Prince Fipha today.

"We have fallen victim to the Queen-bee syndrome.

And it's a pity that some of us don't speak openly when given an opportunity to express themselves, instead we choose to heap praise on the Senate President, despite glaring leadership inefficiencies," said a concerned senator. By now, the concerned senators said, they should be having Sessional Committee Chairpersons, but that process is being stalled deliberately, allegedly by the senate president, to ensure only those willing to lick her boots continued to enjoy their stay in parliament.

The Senate President, however, denied the allegations that she was behind the unfair selection of senators taking external trips. She said cabinet ministers enjoyed the right to choose which legislators they wanted to travel with to international assignments.

Frustrated Chief Mvimbi wants out of committee

A frustrated chairman of the health portfolio committee, Senator Chief Mvimbi Matse, is contemplating resigning from his position.

Senator Matse, a chief of Mambane in the Lubombo region and royal appointee into the senate, said the biasness and total neglect have made him realise he was not wanted in the position. The chief is concerned that his services are appreciated only when performing duties locally, but when the need to extend his services outside of the country, he was always sidelined in favour of other senators.

"I have since resolved to distance. myself from these issues. Otherwise, this is what makes people end up resorting to witchcraft practices," said Chief Mvimbi.

The chief said ever-since his elec-

tion or appointment into the chairmanship position, he has remained nothing but a figure-head.

He said some of his colleagues had been to the United States of America, Cape Town in South Africa and many other cities of the world. After these lucrative trips, Senator Mvimbi said no reports were prepared in readiness for tabling in the senate.

Determined to find answers on the matter, Matse said, he once approached NERCHA Director Khanya Mabuza. He said Mabuza shifted blame to the ministry of health, saying it was the ministry that was responsible for selecting participants.

"We all thought we had come to work and hoped we'd be given equal opportunities to perform our duties. But that is not happening. I sometimes tend to wonder why didn't they choose and appoint, into these positions, those who liked travelling, instead of making us statues," said the aggrieved chief.

Senate President Gelane Zwane sympathised with Chief Matse and implored him to remain patient, adding that his turn would eventually come.

Senator Prince Kekela, another royal appointee in the upper chamber, also said he had never had any external trip.

The chief of Mvuma in the northem Hhohho region, however, stated he was not disturbed by these developments. He said he had several royal duties that kept him busy internally. If assigned by the senate president, he said he can't turn down that assignment.

Shebeen queen gets E50 000 bail

JULIA Mdluli, the 50-year-old woman from Mkhitsini, who was last Friday found with dagga valued close to E500 000, has been granted bail of E50 000.

The popular shebeen queen successfully applied for bail through prominent legal eagle Advocate Mduduzi 'Tsotsi' Mabila.

When making her first court appearance, before Shiselweni Principal Magistrate Florence Msibi, Mdluli was informed of the conditions of the bail which she needed to respect. With her admitted to E50 000 bail, she was ordered to pay E10 000 cash and E40 000 surety. She entered a vehicle as surety.

The suspect was warned by the court which said that she should make no mistake of failing to stick to the set bail conditions. She was advised to surrender her travel documents to the police station and also never to apply for a new one, until the



finalisation of the court case.

She was further advised not to interfere with the crown witnesses in any manner. She was also ordered to make it a point that she reports at the Nhlangano Police Station every first Friday, of each month, and also avails herself each time she was needed in court.

The suspect's next court appearance is July 28, 2016, for further instructions and setting of the trial date. The woman was allegedly found with dagga, packed in bags and ready to be transported. She is said to not be a first offender, as she was once arrest-

ed a couple of years ago for dagga possession. She was handed a 15-year sentence or a sum of E15 000 fine. The court, however, suspended five years of the sentence which meant she ended up paying E10 000 as a fine for this previous crime. The conditions were that she should not be found to have committed a similar crime within a three-year period.

It now remains to be seen how the court will deal with the suspect when the trial begins, as the Crown will be forwarding the previous conviction during its submissions to ask for a stiffer penalty this time around.

...Revamped Manzini-Matsapha highway puts Manzini closer to first world status

THE ongoing rehabilitation of the Matsapha-Manzini highway will be completed at the end of this month.

This has been confirmed by the ministry of public works and transport as well as the contractor, Kukhanya Civil Engineering Contractors.

Chief Roads Engineer in the Public Works and Transport Ministry Vincent Dlamini told Manzini News that the ministry was happy to have been able to deliver this project at a time when the country is gearing towards first world status.

Landscape

He stated that this was one of the indicators that vision 2022 was not just a dream but a reality. He also hinted on the ongoing construction of the Manzini-Mbadlane highway as one of the road infrastructure development projects that will change the landscape of the Hub of Swaziland.

Dlamini stated that the road traffic interchange that will be constructed at the golf course traffic lights as part of the highway would transform Manzini into a global standard city.

As the Municipal Council of Manzini, we are grateful for the support we are receiving from the central government in our quest

towards realisation of our vision of being a vibrant African city that consistently provides efficient, relevant and sustainable services to its customers. Without their support we would not achieve the development that the citizens of Manzini are witnessing.

Of course, we are aware that many sentiments have been shared by road users regarding traffic flow interruptions during the construction period. However, to us all those temporary inconveniences were part of the transformation to first world status. Show me one developed country in the world which achieved development without a dose of discomfort by its citizens; I will tell you of far more than 20 that are where they are today in terms of development as a result of a citizenry that became tolerant to temporary discomfort and focused on the bigger picture. **Project**

As rightfully stated by the chief roads engineer during the interview with Manzini News, traffic interruptions are common during road construction works; moreso in busy roads such as the Matsapha-Manzini highway. Those who travel will recall that in neighbouring South Africa, for example, it is common to be blocked for up to two hours at a

road construction site before being allowed to proceed with your journey. We did not see such during the Matsapha-Manzini road rehabilitation project. As Council we are grateful to Kukhanya Civil Engineering Contractors for tapping into modern technology to try and speed up construction works whilst also ensuring that a high quality road is delivered. If you take into account the fact that the road was over 20 years old and is also used by heavy haulage trucks, you can surely imagine the amount of work that the contractor had to do on the base layers of the road before finally laying the bitumen. That alone should justify the period taken to bring the project to finality. WE'VE GIVING THE ROAD 20 MORE YEARS - KUKHANYA

KUKHANYA Civil Engineering Contractors has confirmed that it will have completed the Matsapha-Manzini road rehabilitation project by the end of this month.

"We're well on course to finishing at the end of this month. I can confirm that there will be no more traffic flow interruptions on that road after July 31st 2016. The only things that we shall be doing after July will be minor works such as road marking, putting up signage, working on the guardrails and a few other small works that will not interrupt traffic flow. We have added 20 more years to the lifespan of that road," said Kukhanya Corporate Affairs Manager Welile Shongwe. She apologised for the disturbances that road users have had to endure over the construction period; further explaining that such was normal with insitu constructions. Insitu construction refers to rehabilitation works whilst the road is live. It requires the use of specialised high technology equipment; which Kukhanya duly utilised.

"We have said it over and over that we apologise for the inconvenience caused to road users. We are emphasising that even

The delays were by all means not deliberate but came as a result of the traffic volumes on that road. This project is the first of its kind in Swaziland. The Matsapha-Manzini road stretch carries the heaviest traffic volumes in the whole of Swaziland. Just 10 minutes of blocking the road at KaKhoza, traffic would stretch as far as Matsapha. We invested in specialised high technology equipment as part of an effort to minimise road user inconveniences. We are happy to have finally been able to complete the project. Indeed Manzini will not be the same,' said the manager.

...PEDESTRIAN FOOTBRIDGE FOR MANGWANENI

THE ministry of public works and transport together with the Municipal Council of Manzini are worried about the frequency of traffic accidents along the Central Distributor Road; particularly the section near Mangwaneni Informal Settlement.

As a result, the ministry has decided to intervene by incorporating a pedestrian footbridge as part of the Manzini-Mbadlane highway.

"We have heard the sentiments regarding accidents as caused by over-speeding on that road. We are also aware that Council constructed a speed hump not so long ago in an effort to cut down on speed but it seems the effort is not yielding the desired outcome.

As a result, we are going to construct an overhead footbridge near Mangwaneni so pedestrians can use that facility instead of risking their lives on the road. The footbridge will form part of the ongoing Manzini-Mbadlane road; which means that it should be up by the time the highway project is completed. In the meantime, we urge residents of Mangwaneni and all other pedestrians who utilise that road to make use of the designated crossing points as well as exercise caution whilst crossing," said Vincent Dlamini. Ministry of Public Works and Transport Chief Roads Engineer.

... WORKS MINISTRY HAS BIG PLANS FOR MANZINI

THE Municipal Council of Manzini has as part of her vision construction of a flyover bridge by the Manzini Nazarene traffic lights so that vehicles heading for either the city centre or Sikhuphe do not have to stop at the traffic lights; a concept somewhat similar to the Matsapha flyover bridge.

Well, Manzini News picked the ministry's thought regarding that proposal and it wonderfully turned out it had even bigger plans for the kingdom's vibrant hub.

Public Works and Transport Ministry's Chief Roads Engineer, Vincent Dlamini, said, depending on funding availability, the ministry was looking at a gigantic fly-over by-pass road for Manzini; one that would start at KaKhoza and connect with the Manzini-Mbadlane highway near Moneni.

We feel that putting up a flyover bridge at the Nazarene traffic lights and then make the road user endure the speed humps and traffic lights on the rest of the Central Distributor Road would kill the road's purpose as a bypass. A ypass road should not have speed humps and traffic lights. The motorist should just cruise without having to stop : nywhere. Just like it's the case with the Mbabane bypass road. Bypass

But again, we don't want the bypass road to be too far from Manzini city so that the tourist or any other road user can have a glimpse of the city from an elevated position whilst travelling through. That is why we are looking at a flyover bypass road that will stretch from KaKhoza to Moneni. The Central Distributor

road will still be there to distribute traffic coming in and out of Manzini but beneath the bypass road. I can't say when this world class bypass road will be constructed as it will depend on funding availability but it is there in our future plans in order to complete the puzzle on the Ngwenya-Sikhuphe highway," he stated. Dlamini is upbeat that the road

infrastructure development planned for Manzini will change the landscape of the kingdom's hub and prove to any doubting Thomas that indeed Swaziland is headed for first world status come 2022.

"We see these nice looking road infrastructure when we travel outside the country. What should stop us from doing same? If you take a look at the out-of-this-world road intersection that will be built

at Manzini's golf course traffic lights as part of the Manzini-Mbadlane highway you will realise that indeed we mean serious business. Manzini and Swaziland at large will never be the same after construction of that highway. The golf course traffic lights will be a thing of the past to give way to the world class road intersection that will be constructed on that site. Same with Hhelehhele and other major road intersections along the highway. Next year we will also spare some funds towards completion of resealing (rehabilitation) of Ngwane and Nkoseluhlaza Streets (main roads within the Manzini city centre); a project which we had already started. We hope that the people of Manzini appreciate and will be excited about the upcoming development in their city," Dlamini said.

OCEAN BASKET MANAGER SUSPENDED

OCEAN Basket Marketing Manager Hector Ndlandla has been suspended for allegedly over-spending on staff food and verbally abusing staff.

Ndlandla was allegedly suspended without pay pending appearance before a disciplinary tribunal on charges of dishonesty, unauthorised expenditure of staff food and incompatibility in that since he was employed, he verbally abused staff and confronted the company's directors. It was alleged that in April and May 2016, on different occasions, he spent about E300 on staff food when he was only authorised to spend E74 per day.

However, he allegedly spent E117, E139 and E89 on different days. He was also charged with dishonesty in that he misstated that some five invoices were for staff meals when they had been for customers who had bought food from the outlet and allegedly stole the amount.

He was further charged with insolence in that he made disparaging remarks concerning one of the directors of the company. The directors of the company are Mbabane senior lawyer Zweli Jele and his wife, Thokozile Vilakati. He is challenging the suspension seeking an order declaring it unlawful. Zwetho Investments, trading as Ocean Basket, is yet to file responding papers in the mat-

Ndlandla is representing himself in the matter. Prior to the suspension and invitation to a disciplinary hearing, he had reported the company to the ministry of labour and social security where he lodged a complaint pertaining to his entitlement to commission and

Further he had reported the company for its unlawful deduction of E1 056 from his monthly salary for accommodation. Ndlandla claimed that he was thereafter invited to attend a disciplinary hearing on May 30, but asked for a postponement because he had been given short notice. The hearing was postponed and another chairman was appointed.

Once again Ndlandla fell sick





Khonta certificate no guarantee for citizenship

FOREIGN nationals seeking settlement rights through the traditional *kukhonta* system are not automatically eligible for citizenship.

A source at the ministry of home affairs revealed that obtaining a khonta certificate did not entitle the certificate holder an 'express' right to be granted citizenship.

The foreigner is required to undergo the same processes, that others go through, in applying for the country's citizenship.

This comes in the wake of concems raised by parliamentarians that foreigners, especially of Asian origin, are flocking into the country and upon arrival, seek settlement rights from chiefs, whom they bribe with huge sums of money.

The fees schedule at the ministry

of home affairs reflect that for a khonta certificate, an applicant is required to part with E500.

The traditional settlement rights system is administered mainly by chiefs in the rural and peri-urban areas of the kingdom.

Members from both legislative chambers have expressed outrage at the apparently uncontrolled influx of the Asians into the country.

A 10-member committee has

been set up by the House of Assembly to investigate the invasion of the country by the Asians.
The committee, led by Zombodze

Emuva MP Titus Thwala, will also investigate officials at the immigration department at the home affairs ministry for allegedly colluding with the Asians and accepting bribes in exchange for work permits and citizenships.

To obtain the longest work permit allowing a foreigner to remain in the country for a maximum 12 months, applicants are required to pay E1 200.

These work permits are granted to company directors and employees of foreign owned companies.

For a nine-month work permit the fees schedule indicates that E900 is required while E600 is paid for a six months work permit.

For the shortest period of three months, E300 is paid by applicants.

Government service charges to go up

THE Swaziland government, which is facing huge economic challenges, is set to increase its service charges to the public.

The ministry of home affairs has already embarked on a process to review the service charges. Home Affairs Principal Secretary, Anthony Masilela, yesterday confirmed that they had made a request for the ministry of finance to have their service charges reviewed.

The review, if approved, would affect both Swazis and foreign nationals.

The review would lead to an increase in the fees paid by applicants to obtain travel documents, passports, work permits, renewals and other services provided by the department of Birth, Marriages and Death (BMDs) under the min-

istry. The proposal for the review, Masilela said, was made in the last government financial year. He said they had not yet received a response from the ministry of finance where they submitted their request. The BMDs department is one of the most frequently visited government department because of the nature of the services it provides to the public.

Currently, people applying for travel documents pay E80, as well as the same amount for renewal while E120 is paid for a lost or destroyed travel document. For an international and diplomatic passport, currently, applicants pay E200.

Foreigners interested in obtaining the country's citizenship are charged a E500 application fee. But it becomes cheaper when the person applying is a female married to a Swazi because they are only required to pay E100.

Once the application has been approved and the applicant is

granted the citizenship, an additional E1 000 is paid by the applicant in both categories.

The amount is a bit higher if the citizenship application is done for a child who was born before the parents acquired the Swazi citizenship.

According to a fee schedule displayed at the ministry of home affairs that child is required to pay E5 000. A child born of parents who have already acquired the citizenship automatically becomes a citizen of the country. The economy of the country has been facing challenges, leading to very insignificant growth.

Due to the slow economic growth and, also largely due to a decline in Southern Africa Customs Union (SACU) receipts, the Swaziland government has been forced to increase and diversify its tax-base. For the past decade, the government has been

depending on the SACU receipts to finance its budget.

However, with a sharp decline in the SACU receipts, the Swaziland Revenue Authority was set up to help increase revenue collections

In his 2016/17 budget speech, Finance Minister Martin Dlamini reported that this year government's projections reflected that a paltry E4.5 billion would be received, down from E6.9 Billion that was obtained the previous year.

In previous years the government received as high as E9 billion from the regional customs union body.

A few weeks ago, Tourism and Environmental Affairs Minister Jabulani Mabuza had his attempts to impose a 35 cents plastic levy on the public dismissed by the House of Assembly. This was viewed as another way of diversifying government's tax-base by the legislators.

AU recognises African editors

AFRICAN editors have been roped-in by the African Union (AU) to help the organisation successfully implement Agenda 2063.

This is an initiative decided upon by the AU, during the recently held Summit in Rwanda, Kigali. The AU had invited editors to be part of the meeting to find out how the media could play a role in making sure Agenda 2063 was met.

Implementing

The agenda will be met by implementing plans of action that will span over a period of 10 years.

Swaziland Editors' Forum Chairperson, Mbongeni Mbingo, was also invited to attend the meeting.

Mbingo, who is also the managing editor of The Swazi Observer, said this was the first of its kind in the history of the African Union.

He said the AU has seen the importance of the role that can be played by the African media in

implementing the Agenda 2063. He acknowledged the fact that many of the people living today would not be alive by 2063, but that did not mean Africans should not start implementing the agenda.

He stated that Africa had 10year targets that it set for itself to meet as it implemented the agenda.

Recognise

He said the outgoing African Union Commission Chairperson Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma stated during the meeting that they would eventually recognise the media as one of the key stakeholders in implementing the agenda.

Agenda 2063 is an initiative, taken by the AU, to make the continent prosperous. It is an initiative taken by the African Union Commission to make the 21st century an African century.

The agenda is rooted on Pan Africanism and an African Renaissance.

In 2063, Africa sees itself as a continent that is prosperous, with the resources that will drive its own development, with sustainable and long-term stewardship of its resources.

At that time, Africa sees itself as having provided for its people a high standard of living with a sound and healthy well-being.

People of Africa at that time will be well educated and skilled, especially in disciplines of science and technology.

No child should miss school by then because of poverty or any form of discrimination.

African cities and other settlements by 2063 should be hubs of cultural and economic activities.

Affordable

The infrastructure should be modernised and people should have access to affordable and decent housing, including housing finance and all the basic necessities of life like water, sanitation, energy, public transport and ICT.

Economies of all African countries, at that time, should be structurally transformed to create shared growth, decent jobs and economic opportunities for all.

Agriculture should be improved to increase food production for Africa.

The ecosystems and wildlife in Africa will also be protected in this continent by that time.

Agenda 2063 idea conceived in 2013 THE idea of the Agenda 2063 was conceived in 2013 when the African Union was celebrating its 50 years of existence.

This took place in Addis Ababa, the capital city of Ethiopia. The African leaders met to look back at what had been achieved by the AU, which was the Organisation of African Unity at the time.

It had been formed to help many African countries achieve independence from colonial masters, which comprised the British, French, Belgians, and Germans among others.

Independence

In 2013, the African leaders acknowledged that Africa had already attained its independence, but they realised that more needed to be done.

They noted that Africa needed to foster international relations among themselves as African countries.

They also noted that for Africa to develop, trade conditions between themselves had to be more favourable so that they can generate more income through one another.

The issue of language barriers was also raised at that meeting, which made African leaders relish at the idea of one Africa that spoke one language, having one currency and one passport that will allow ease of movement among African natives from one African country to another.

Dlamini-Zuma reads letter to African freedom fighters

OUTGOING African Union Commission Chairperson, Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma, was given an opportunity to read a letter, which was written to late African freedom fighters like Kwame Nkrumah.

In that letter, Dlamini-Zuma imitated an Africa, which was already in 2063. She imagined African freedom fighters as people who would be reading the letter, while sitting outside the African continent.

Improved

In the letter, Dlamini-Zuma was telling the fighters that Africa was now a united continent, which had developed economically because of the improved trade relations between them.

She also highlighted that Africa was also at ease in terms of communication, because it was now speaking an African language, which was understood by all Africans in every African country.

African languages like Swahili were recognised as one of these languages. English, French and other non-African languages were completely out of the agenda.

Man suspects one of the trafficked children to be his

AFTER reports of a Swazi who was arrested in South Africa for trafficking three children aged five, seven and 13 years old, a father whose child disappeared last year believes one of the trafficked victims might be his own child.

Bonginkhosi Thwala said after reading the article and noting that one of the children was seven years old his hopes of re-uniting with his long lost son were revived. He said his son Bongiswa Thwala (7) mysteriously disappeared during a visit to his relatives at Hlatsi.

He said upon reading an article in the Swazi Observer titled 'Swazi arrested in SA for trafficking three children' dated 16/06/2016, he believed that his child might be among the three children.

Thwala said his son went with two other children to the river with the aim of taking a swim.

He said his son, who grew up around Matsapha, was not used to big dams in the rural areas hence he told his peers that he was going back home.

Thwala said his son never made it home, and when the other children returned it was discovered that Bongiswa was not among them. A search for him around the area proved futile as the young boy was nowhere to be found.

He said all this happened while he was at Matsapha, where he is currently staying and only got to know about the incident the next day, which was a Monday.

He said he dropped everything he was doing and called the police, who opened a case for a missing child.

He said a certain woman Zodwa* (name withheld for ethical reasons) was a prime suspect in the matter of the missing child it is said on the day the child disappeared Zodwa had informed her family that she was going back to work in

Matsapha.

However, her colleagues at her workplace in Matsapha told a different story, saying they were on break since it was December. And they even stated that Zodwa had told them that she was going to South Africa to visit her boyfriend.

The contradicting statements given by Zodwa didn't go down

well with Thwala, who suggested that she be questioned further by the police. It is said the police officer, who was working on the matter, did not take it seriously as he gave up without solving it.

Thwala said he tried to advise the officer that he must try and get phone call records from Swazi MTN, so that he would know Zodwa's conversations, as she was suspected of having trafficked the child to South Africa.

He said the police officer told him they were no longer given call records from MTN, as the company told them that they were being sued because of having done so. Bongiswa's father said he did not get any feedback from the officer.

He said he only got a call recently from the Nhlangano police, who told him that they found a docket of the missing child lying idle and they were now working on the matter. Dlamini said the police promised to work with Interpol in solving the case.

Pastor sees missing child in a vision

THE father of a missing sevenyear-old child said one of the family members had revealed that her pastor, whom he only referred to as Pastor Ndaba, told her during a prayer that he had a vision and saw the missing boy. It is said the pastor directed the woman to the exact location where the boy was to be found.

Find

The pastor told the young woman that next to the place, where they were going to find the young man, was a dead animal. And upon seeing the animal they would find the boy nearby.

Directing

Thwala said they went to that area and found the dead animal, which was an iguana (chamu). He said the pastor was directing the search party via Whatsapp messenger application.

He said upon reaching the dead animal, a misunderstanding between the woman, who was helping them, and her husband ensued, leading to the search parties being divided and they couldn't proceed with it.

Thwala said he then lost contact

with the pastor as he left the country for South Africa.

The heartbroken father said he tried every prophet but they all told him the same thing, as they all said the person responsible for the disappearance of his child was a family member.

He said, however, all the pastors told him not to despair as his son was alive.

Taxi driver nabbed for DD

'Lavumisa MP can help with mealie-meal importation'

AS Lavumisa residents complained of the new border importation adjustments hindering them from sourcing more mealie meal from South Africa, NAMBoard Chief Executive Office: Siphephiso Dlamini says the concerned people must engage their member of parliament (MP) on the matter.

NAMBoard is the National Agricultural Marketing Board and has recently notified locals that they would not be able to import mealie meal weighing over 20 kilograms.

Dlamini clarified that such an adjustment was not effected by the parastatal but by government and that it would not only affect Lavumisa border gate.

"This procedure was not effected by NAMBoard unfortunately, and concerns should be directed to the Lavumisa MP Sandile Nxumalo and we will then take it from there," he said.

Attempts to contact MP Nxumalo proved futile as he did not answer his phone.

However, the Indvuna Yenkhundla Dumsani Mbhamali said they would heed the CEO's advice.

"Our people have been badly affected by this. We shall take NAMBoard's advice and correct this problem as the people rely on South Africa for commodities such as the mealie meal," Mbhamali said.

He noted that most of the peo-

ple were still buying mealiemeal from the neighbouring country, while a few of those who could afford to bought it

Economic education increases in Shiselweni

THE Shiselweni region saw a significant increase in the number of schools where pupils were capacitated on basic economic education.

JA's 2015 annual report stated that in 2014, only five schools were reached through the JA company programme (JACO) adding that this figure increased to eight in 2015, marking a 60 percent increase.

JA said the company programme started in March/April 2015, with an initial number of 70 schools (71 clubs).

This programme provided basic economic education for high school pupils by allowing them to organise and operate an actual business.

JA added that pupils not only learnt how businesses function but were also sensitised about the structure of the free enterprise system and the benefits it provide.

Schools from the Hhohho region under the company programme increased from 14 to 20 (30 percent increase), Lubombo 12 to 16 (33.3 percent) and Manzini 21 to 25 schools, marking a 19 percent improvement.

MACFORD WELCOME SIBANDZE

IN my research at the topic, 'Why Women Lose Elections' I found myself on the doorstep of popular woman activist, Doo Aphane, who greatly assisted me on the subject.

Though I was meeting her for the first time, through ex-MP of Ludzeludze, Nonhlanhla Dlamini, I felt at home with her, as she poured her heart out on women issues, nationally, regionally and globally.

Taking a legal, sociological and psychological perspective, Aphane opened my eyes to a number of issues and why women struggle to make impact on the political landscape: why they lose elections, why even when they win, they make little impact, the masculine world, the not so level ground, perceptions, woman to woman, etc.

Locally, 2013, had been a big slap in the face of women activism as only one woman was elected into parliament. A big shout to the people of Mbabane East, for electing Hon. Esther Dlamini, it would have been disgraceful, if not despicable, that with the multitudes of women voters, they could not vote one of their own. Well, this of course does not deserve a loud and cheering applause but at least we have one elected woman! It could have been worse! And unknown to Hon. Esther Dlamini is that her historic election is now used as academic reference point not only among women activism but in top universities in the world.

My other research was on how Swaziland juggled with apartheid South Africa, socialist Mozambique and freedom fighters such as ANC and PAC. This topic took me to Dr. PQ Magagula and the Political Studies department at UNISWA. Once again, Magagula baptised me with hundred tons of academia and intellect and as pastors would say, 'I was never the

I learnt a lot through his brilliant and articulate 'lecture' and gained insights from reading his PhD Thesis on Swaziland's Relations with South Africa and Britain (1988). And as we commemorate the life and times of King Sobhuza II, on July 22, 1 want to look at how, using Dr. PQ's words, King Sobhuza 11, 'walked on a tight rope of diplo-

eastern part. Its economy lies in the periphery of the South African economy. Its rich neighbour, South Africa, as the local geo-economical and political giant, loomed large in the affairs of the kingdom of Swaziland.

SACU AND BULLY TAC-TICS IN THE CONTEXT OF APARTHEID

The apartheid government was legally obliged to continue supporting the country financially through the SACU agreement. Around 95% of the amount originates from South Africa but under the terms of the SACU agreement, it retains less than 50% after distribution to SACU partners; Swaziland, Lesotho as well as Botswana and Namibia. It is this dependence on South Africa that makes micro states like Swaziland to be vulnerable to their rich neighbour, 'a regional bully seeking to usurp the crown from its neighbours.'

APARTHEID, SOCIALISM AND FREEDOM FIGHTERS

When Swaziland got independence, South Africa was under the apartheid regime. The racist government created political instability in the region as it faced fierce opposition from banned parties such as the ANC and PAC. Due to geo-proximity, Swaziland found itself in the middle of a racist South Africa, a socialist FRELIMO-led Mozambique and freedom fighters. In other words, it was in the middle of a crisis; a land-locked country, with no access to the sea, having to balance its relations with both ruling regimes in Pretoria, Lourenco Marques (Maputo) and the freedom fighters for survival. Thus, according to Magagula (1988) King Sobhuza II found himself on a tight rope of diplomacy; being an ANC member yet not antagonising the Boers. And while pro-US, having to deal with a neighbour, Mozambique, who was pro USSR, a big foe for US.

For Swaziland, a deep seated secret was the fear of a socialist FRELLIMO next door in Mozambique.

Angola and Mozambique, had emerged with close relations with the Soviet Union, Cuba and China. For Swaziland, this ideological threat had immediate resonance because of its proximity to Mozambique. At the time Swaziland and Mozambique were not in good books due to ideological differences.

Moreover, Mozambique had become a refugee for all those in the wrong side of King Sobhuza II who sought political asylum. So Swaziland was very apprehensive about the new socialistoriented government in Mozambique. Its egalitarian agenda threatened the Swazi aris-

tocratic order and its aversion for capitalism set it against Swaziland's liberal approach to the economy.

COMMUNISM-A DISEASE TO BE STAMPED OUT

This is the period when communism was demonised and criminalised in such a way that even the ANC did not want to be associated with it. According to the Long Walk to Freedom (1996) in the Rivonia Trial Speech, Mandela disassociated himself with the Communist Party and communist tendencies. And in the book, Thabo Mbeki: Dream Differed (2013) it states that political activist and Rivonia Trialist, Govan Mbeki and his wife's communist tendencies were not welcomed by the ANC for quite some time.

TRUST DEFICIT

Economically, as already established, his survival dependent on his next door rich neighbour, whose seat of power was being destabilised by the ANC, MK, PAC whom King Sobhuza II had given asylum. King Sobhuza II then found himself walking in a red thin line, carefully, in diplomatic eggshells, with each party not feeling trust deficit in this polygamous relations. Yet among the three, apartheid held the four Aces! To satisfy all, King Sobhuza II had to live with the risk which in diplomatic relations has always existed since time immemorial!

Of course this was a risk with devastating consequences as apartheid South Africa was using the economy as a weapon. For a country like Swaziland with full circle dependence on South Africa it would have been disastrous. Countries which were at loggerheads with Pretoria such as Angola and Mozambique felt the wrath of economic weaponry. Though both countries had access to the sea, they were affected as South Africa had geo-proximity with them and its mineral abundance provided employment to its neighbours through migrant labour. And they could not trade with South Africa. Worse, South Africa destabilised them by funding guerrilla insurgencies, UNITA (Angola) and RENAMO (Mozambique) led by Jonas Savimbi and Alfonso Dhlakama respectively.

KOMATI ACCORD-ASKING A FAVOUR FROM YOUR ENEMY!

To prove that economic weaponry was working for the apartheid government, to the shock of Africa, on May 16, 1984, the Komati Accord was signed between South Africa and Mozambique. Part of the Accord was for Mozambique not to harbour freedom fighters from South

Africa and those who were already there had to vacate. On the other hand, South Africa would open trade with Mozambique. To the Boers this was a major triumph- the product of a deliberate, controlled military strategy designed to demonstrate who was the master of Southern Africa. The accord hit hard to freedom fighters hiding in Mozambique as the apartheid killing machine had free access of entry and exit, which was not there before the treaty. Machel's signing of the accord meant it was over for members of the ANC, PAC and SACP who were given asylum by the Mozambique. Many cadres were either arrested, injured or killed. Moreover, they had to change base yet Mozambique was strategic because of its geo-proximity to South Africa compared to Tanzania and Uganda. For King Sobhuza II it meant dealing with a fragile neighbourhood.

The gesture underlined the fact that the gravitational pull of the South African economy had proved difficult to resist. Mozambique was a country in a crisis and with its fall out with USSR, it was a country stripped bare; hunger, poverty, unemployment etc and government had to arrest the situation before it collapsed into a failed state. The solution to the crisis was to ask for a favour from the enemy which underlined the fact that economic hegemony was a key to political dominance.

SOBHUZA II'S OLIVE **BRANCH TO SAMORAH** MACHEL

With such prevailing circumstances, King Sobhuza II was able to sail through the turbulence as he maintained relations with the Boers who were enemy of the blacks while also maintaining close relations with black freedom fighters. He also sent an olive branch to Samorah Machel which culminated in the opening of embassies to both countries. Ironically, in his funeral, the two foes, Samorah Machel and PW Botha, sat next to each other and two years later, bridged the gap of hate, by signing the Komati Accord in 1984. Thus King Sobhuza II's legacy has to be understood from the context of a peacemaker and smooth diplomat! And in Political Studies all over Africa he is honoured as a Statesman in the league of Africa greats such as Nelson Mandela, Kwame Krumah and Julius Nyerere. He is also born in July just like Mandela and Kaundamonth of heroes!

WHEN WOMEN DO WELL, EVERYONE DOES BETTER

When women step into the world of production, rather than being focused exclusively on reproduction, the economy grows



Gender inequality is no longer a burden placed on women alone, particularly in emerging market nations like Brazil, Russia, India and China (BRIC)

versities is the most dramatic change that has occurred since the publication of 'The Feminine Mystique'.

Women now comprise roughly 60 percent of college students in the United State and that trend is becoming evident in other countries. In Africa, if girls can complete secondary school, they stand a greater chance of leaving poverty behind and seeing prosperity ahead.

Less obvious is that violence against women is toxic to women's ability to improve their lives. Girls and their parents need to feel safe to go to school and work without fear of being molested, raped or killed.

Where does religion come in?
Eighty percent of the population, including women, in the Arab world support sharia law. But that figure does not necessarily doom women to second class citizenship.

Many women, having helped ignite the revolution in several countries, are now unwilling to step back into the shadows. Sharia law has many interpretations. Women are reading the (religious) texts themselves; they are fighting religion with religion.

A source of conflict for women everywhere is the pull between reproduction and production. Women worldwide have difficulty in balancing their dual roles as caregivers and providers. Access to family planning is crucial, expressed by women as, "sovereignty over our own bodies."

Policies such as maternity leave, sick leave, workplace flex-ibility and childcare make it more possible for women to fulfil both roles. (Ironically, the United States, the richest country in the world, lags behind the rest of the world in this regard.)

Power

Investment in women's earning power pays a large dividend for the entire family. Studies have shown that women spend their earnings differently from men. They invest it on their children's education, food, clothing and health care.

Men are more likely to spend their cash on alcohol, cigarettes, entertainment and cars. One study concluded that women spend 90 percent of their income on their families.

Political leadership is beginning to change from "pale and male" to greater diversity thanks to gender quotas. In 1997 the average percentage of women in parliaments around the world was 12 percent. The latest figure places that percentage at 21 percent. (The U.S.is below average, at 17.8 percent).

How do we create the needed changes to improve the condition of women everywhere? There is cause for pessimism when we look at the increased rates of trafficking of women and girls.

Some 42 million human beings are trafficked around the world, often into slavery. Female infanticide is growing, with the aid of ultra sounds.

"Missing", (or murdered) infants, girls and women number 3.9 million women below the age of 30.

One answer is "naming and shaming." exposing these statistics, in ranking order, to the cleansing solution of sunlight.

There is also cause for optimism. Change is happening in unexpected ways that have little to do with government intervention. The most optimistic conclusion is that gender inequality is losing ground and that gender equality is gaining strength.

The hard data in support of equal opportunity for men and women is becoming an increasingly powerful tool for change. As countries digest these facts, the pressure for them to recognise that the old ways of suppressing women's potential must be counteracted because they are self-defeating.

By limiting opportunities for women, they are limiting their own economic growth.

We must speed up the time table for fathers, brothers and sons to provide their mothers, daughters and sisters with the same opportunities that they give themselves. The result will be a more prosperous and stable world, far beyond what Betty Friedan could have imagined 50 years ago.

WHEN Betty Friedan published The Feminine Mystique 50 years ago, little did she know that her call for greater gender equality for American women would reverberate around the world and impact the economic condition of women and men.

Today, we have the evidence to

Today, we have the evidence to demonstrate there is a direct link between gender equality and economic growth. Those countries that invest in the education of women and girls have showed the highest rate of GDP increase. And the reverse is true; those countries that continue to treat women as lesser human beings and bar them from education because of tradition or religion stifle their country's ability to prosper.

This has been the conclusion of the World Bank, the World Economic Forum and the United Nations. Simply put, when women do well, everybody does better. It is not hard to figure out why. When women step into the world of production, rather than being focused exclusively on reproduction, the economy grows.

The greater the percentage of women in the workforce, the greater the number of goods and services will be produced and sold.

Gender inequality is no longer a burden placed on women alone, particularly in emerging market nations like Brazil, Russia, India and China (BRIC).

Restrictions on women either to education or to their safety— act like a dead weight on the best-laid plans to boost economic growth and political stability.

This was the message from the symposium I recently participated in on 'Gender Inequality and Emerging Markets' at Green Templeton College at Oxford University.

When Clinton, upon assuming the post, elevated the Office of Global Women's Issues to ambassadorial level by appointing Melanne Verveer as its first ambassador, many assumed that women's issues would still be side-lined as soft issues. The real action lies elsewhere, they believed, where the men continue to strategise in traditional ways about how to keep the world safe for democracy.

But the more we learn about the untapped contributions that women can make to the economy and to civil society, the more clearer it becomes that the push for gender equality is central to our continuing quest for global stability.

The key to gender equality is obvious: access to education for girls. In a study of 100 countries, The World Bank found that every one percent increase in the proportion of women with a secondary education raises a country's per capita income growth by about 0.3 percent.

The high percentage of women in secondary schools and in uni-

SD TOPS AFRICA IN CROSS BORDER TRADE FACILITA

SWAZILAND is ranked top in Africa under the management and facilitation of cross border trade dubbed 'the Big Bang,' according to the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa.

The country is currently ranked number 30 in the world, according to the World Bank, investor road map rating on trading across bor-

This means the country has moved 128 places up between 2010 and 2016, after it only edged at 158 out of 171 countries in 2010 in the World Bank ratings in trading across borders.

This was revealed during the second steering committee meeting for the Automated System for Customs Data (ASYCUDA) which took place at the Royal Swazi Sun Hotel, Ezulwini, early this month.

According to a statement by COMESA, the meeting brought together members of the steering committee drawn from the Swaziland Revenue Authority, the ministries in charge of commerce and international trade, finance and economic planning. Others were the Federation of Swaziland Employers and Chambers of Commerce, the European Union



Commission, United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, and COMESA.

COMESA said the meeting took stock of the progress made thus far on the implementation of the project and to reflect on any challenges in the implementation of the ASYCUDA World system after its launch on February 1.

SRA Commissioner General Dumisani Masilela said the outcome of the evaluation would enable SRA and the steering committee to determine a way forward on the rollout programme of the system and ensure that the benefits of the system were effectively realised.

"Unlike many administrations which have implemented a similar system ahead of us, we opted for a 'Big Bang' instead of a 'Phased' implementation approach."

He said despite a few connectivity challenges which were experienced during the first few days of implementation, this approach presented a number of advantages as reporting information was sourced from one system instead of two separate ones

Success

COMESA Secretary General Sindiso Ngwenya urged other COMESA member states to emulate Swaziland's success on the ease of doing business.

He said the key benefits of the ASYCUDA system was the reduction in the border waiting time, as traders could clear their consignment before it physically arrived at the points of entry.

Ngwenya congratulated the country for the successful roll-out of the project and called for further improvement of the information

and communications technology sector if Swaziland is to sustain the various automated projects which have been implemented recently. He applauded the EU, UNCTAD, and government for the invaluable contribution made towards the implementation of the project.

THERE has been an increase of 1.9 percent in broad money held within the banking sector as evidenced by the increase in money supply in the Swazi economy.

According to the Central Bank of Swaziland recent economic development report May/June 2016, broad money supply settled at E13.7 billion. Broad money is the total money that is floating within the economy, it is broken down in quasi money and narrow money.

The CBS reported that narrow money, which refers to all the total money in coins and notes increased by 1.5 percent to a high of E4.6 billion. While, time deposits and savings deposits also known as quasi money increased by 2.1 percent to E9.1 billion.

"The growth in narrow money was on account of an increase in transferable deposits which increased by 2.6 per cent which

outpaced a decline in currency outside depository corporations which contracted by sick per cent," said CBS.

The rise in quasi money supply was reflected in both its components, savings and time deposits which rose by 3.4 per cent and 1.8 per cent, respectively.

Compared annually, quasi money grew by 19.2 per cent, narrow money supply by eight per cent and quasi money by 25.8 per cent.

However, savings deposits over the same period have experienced relatively flat growth.

According to an economist, who spoke on condition of anonymity from one of the leading banks, increase in time deposits was largely accountable to corporates.

"The increase could be driven by larger volumes being deposited as

corporates are motivated by the higher interest rate environment," she said.

"Time deposits by their nature yield higher returns than savings deposits because banks keep time deposits for longer than savings deposits," she further noted.

The financial economist said interestingly there has been little significant increase in deposits by individuals, which may be a

sign that individuals are not taking advantage of the high interest rate environment to maximise the returns they get from depositing money at the bank. Savings deposits over the same period have

experienced relatively flat growth.

Savings deposits are those accounts that are held for transaction purposes like the ones tied to an ATM card account.

"Savings deposits are not exactly stagnant; they are just growing at a slower pace than time deposits," the economist said.

The economist explained that the preference of the type of deposit chosen was largely tied to the purpose for which an individual was using those deposits.

"An individual could have both a savings and time deposits with a bank and keep them both for different reasons," she said.

"They could keep the savings deposit account because he can withdraw it anytime unlike time deposits in which the deposit is fixed for a certain period," she

"It depends on their preference. that being said, I cannot say if Swazis have grown to prefer time deposits over savings deposits." she added.

"From the data I have observed, as I have mentioned, it is mainly the corporates that are driving the growth rates of time deposits and therefore driving up the money supply in the economy," she said.

REGIONAL INTEGRATION, KEY FOR IMPROVING AGRIC VALUE CHAIN

REGIONAL Integration is key if the Southern African countries would like to move upward in the agricultural value chain.

This observation was made by Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati during the official opening of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) meeting of senior officials preceding the SADC meeting of ministers of agriculture and food security.

"It is imperative that countries like Swaziland cease just being primary producers and look towards making finished goods," he said. The minister made the example of Swaziland's number one agricultural export, sugar.

"Sugar is our main agricultural product which we export to the European market. However, I have observed that there are numerous sugar based products we import and as a result the sugar we export could be understood to being sold back to us with added value," he said.

The minister said the regional meeting was of significant importance to the development of agriculture within SADC member states as it provides a platform for the discussion of critical issues that affects the sector.

"This is where tailor made solutions to our food security are developed together with their implementation strategies.

"The SADC regional agriculture policy and its investment plan are critical documents that should be implemented to the letter if we are to win the fight against food insecurity. It should be regarded as a guide for developing our agricul-

ture to a stage where we will go beyond being just primary producers," he said.

The minister said the geographical location of the SADC countries makes them share some kind of homogeneity in terms of the problems they face in agriculture.

"This is more because we share almost similar environmental conditions. What compounds this situation even further is the fact that we share boundaries and that makes some of our problems cross-boundary. All this makes it necessary to meet in this manner and employ a regional approach to solving problems and developing our agriculture," he said.

Vilakati said one cannot overemphasise the urgent need for the region to up-scale innovation in the area of Climate-smart Agriculture.

"We should give priority to water harvesting technologies and efficient irrigation systems. We should also move fast in our breeding programmes for climate tolerance and resilience."

The minister challenged the institutions such as the Centre for Coordination of Agricultural Research and Development in Southern Africa (CCARDESA) and the SADC Plant Genetic Resource Centre (SPGRC) to work closely in terms of assisting member states in applying the best research and development practices using the available genetic materials.

Maize prices might fall in 2017

WITH the highly anticipated bumper harvest resulting from the projected La Nina phenomenon, the region's and the country's maize price might fall.

According to South African media reports, in the Republic white maize prices were projected to drop to around E4 300 a tonne for white maize, while yellow maize was expected to fall to about E3 600 a tonne.

In 2015/2016, Swaziland imported over 29 000 metric tons of white maize from South Africa, according to Grain SA and as prices surged in the Republic and in the region, the National Maize Corporation was faced with a price squeeze.

As a result, according to the NMC price list, prior to November 2015, a 25kg of maize in the country cost around E88 and a 70kg E240. However, by February 2016, the price was up almost 70 percent.

NMC attributed the price upsurge to the continuous increase of maize prices in the region.

The US Department of Agriculture expects 2016/2017 corn production almost to double to 13.0 million tons following the anticipated improvement in conditions associated with a La Nina weather pattern.

Falling

Prices are seen falling next year after the early-February pollination stage passes if La Nina conditions materialise, the head of economic and agricultural intelligence at the agricultural business chamber, Wandile Sihlobo, told Reuters.

"(We) will be seeing pretty much some levels of normalisation and prices coming pretty much back to what we saw in 2013/2014," Sihlobo said.

La Nina, the opposite of El Nino, which generally affects the same regions as El Nino, tends to produce above-average rainfall and in some cases cooler temperatures.

Experts said should weather forecasts remain on course, agricultural production would be expected to bounce back by mid-2017 resulting in significant moderation in food prices, particularly grains.

Swaziland's projected yields is approximately 33 000 metric tonnes, which is about 12 000 tonnes short of the 1991/92 drought season yields where 45 000 metric tonnes was obtained.

Consumers can for now rest their hopes on the occurrence of La Nina, which is highly anticipated to result to bumper harvest in 2017.





INVESTMENTS



AN investment is an asset or item that is purchased with the hope that it will generate income or appreciate in the future.

It is the purchase of products or services that are not consumed today but are used in the future to create wealth.

From an economic/finance perspective it is worth noting that, investments and savings are different; Savings is the act of putting money away in a safe place with the intention of using the money in the future, investing involves committing money into an investment product in the hopes of making a financial gain.

Types of Investments

Nowadays, consumers in Swaziland have a wide range of investment products to choose from. It is very important that when looking to invest, one takes time to choose an investment product that is at par with his/her investment budget, goals, objective, and risk pro-

The vast different types of investments in existence are classified into the two investment classes below:

Real Assets:

These are physical or tangible assets that have value and can directly contribute in the production of goods and services due to their substance and properties. Real assets include precious metals, commodities, real estate, land, machinery etc.

Financial Assets:

These are intangible (non-physical) liquid assets that derive value because of a contractual claim of what they represent. Unlike land, property, commodities or other tangible physical assets, financial





assets do not necessarily have physical worth but withinbeing no more than just worthless papers and not directly contributing to the production of a commodity or service, they derive their great value from the claims they carry. Shares, bonds, bank deposits etc.

Individual and business investors may require both financial and real assets to continue to meet their financial and investment requirements.

A diversified (varied) portfolio with a balance of financial and real assets provides stability in the portfolio during the ups and downs of the financial market as it is more unstable and risky.

Investment Risk

When making an investment decision, an investor needs to also consider risk. Investment risk is the uncertainty of achieving the returns

as per the expectations of the investor.

With investments the level of risk associated with a particular investment or asset class typically relates with the level of return the investment might achieve.

Investment Risks are categorised according to their source and they include:

- 1. Business Risk Is that which comes from the nature of the industry. For example, companies in different fields like agriculture, are affected by factors such as; weather conditions, cold waves and frost or extreme heat or diseases etc.
- 2. Economic Risk Resulting from changes in macroeconomic factors such as rates of unemployment, inflation, government spending, budget deficits etc. These risks affect almost all sectors, but they





vary in the magnitude of the impact depending on the relevance of the industry type to any of the overall economic factors.

- 3. Interest Rate Risk Is the risk resulting from changes in interest rates in the financial system of the economy. This risk affects the financial sector and the companies operating in it, particularly banks.
- 4. Exchange Rate Risk -Stemming from changes in currency exchange rates. Usually, companies working in the business of importing and exporting are more influenced by this type of risk.

5. Liquidity Risk - It arises from the possibility of converting investment into cash (liquidating it). The higher the possibility of investment liquidation, the lower the risk and return.

Easing of risk remains the most important feature of an investment portfolio (a collection of investments held by in individual, company etc.).

However, it is possible to have a stable return from investments with the presence of risk through a finance principle known as diversification. Diversification originally serves the investor in reducing the risk to their minimum, but it is not possible to eliminate all risk eventually.

Capacity building hinders radio producing industry growth

LACK of funds for capacity building in radio production is stifling the growth of the indus-

National Association of Development Programme Producers (NADPP) Chairperson Ntfombiyembuso Tfwala said one of the initiatives of the body was to facilitate capacity building of members as this would improve their skills and further strengthen the producing industry.

She decried the lack of support from owners of the programmes in government departments, ministries, non-governmental organisations (NGO) and state owned enterprises in terms of capacity

"As a group, the members feel that previous in-country workshops in radio production, sponsored by various donor agencies, did not sufficiently meet their needs.

Capacity

The ministry responsible for broadcasting (ICT) does not include the development programme producers in their training and capacity building programmes as only the state broadcasters belong to the ministry and the personnel from other ministries and NGOs, etc is excluded," she said.

Tfwala further explained the work of producers.

"Gathering programme materials is not done weekly. The general

pattern is that producers go into the field to collect materials for several programmes at a time. They also go into the field when a special event with their target audience is occurring or upon request by the intervention agency. Field activities do not always run smoothly for the producers.

Developing

They are sometimes hampered by the same problems that beset field personnel in other developing countries.

For example, transportation is not always available and hardware breakages and software shortages may occur," she explained.

Adding, Thwala said development producers combined their knowledge of the technical

requirements needed to bring about a change with the target audiences and their communication expertise.

"Knowing the comprehension needs of the targets is critical because it gives producers a better understanding of which interventions will or will not work," she said. Producers need a platform to release their work and the Swaziland Broadcasting and Information Services (SBIS) is one such outlet, Tfwala noted.

Critical

"Producers provide the critical local content that cannot be provided by the state broadcasters like SBIS, she said.

"However there seems to be a lack of mutual relationship

between SBIS and the different stakeholders like the supervisors of radio programme producers," she added. To put the presentation into context, the chairperson of NADPP further highlighted the importance of producers in the country. "Producers disseminate accurate developmental information drawn of the Government of Swaziland. Which is can and often is used as a tool to preserve Swazi culture," she said. Tfwala concluded by laying out some of the other issues faced by the industry in general. "The resources available for equipment is inadequate for the industry. There is no human resource development plan to cater for the training needs of producers. There is also an acute lack of support by supervisors to NADPP team, for instance, in relation to time, she closed.

EU WATCHDOG BACKS 'PASSPORT' FOR US HEDGE FUNDS IN EUROPE

EUROPEAN UNION - Hedge funds from the United States, Singapore and Hong Kong should be allowed to market themselves in the European Union, the bloc's financial watchdog said yesterday.

The long-delayed recommendation from the European Securities and Markets Authority (ESMA) to the EU's executive European Commission for endorsement is a taste of what Britain's financial services sector might face after it leaves the bloc.

A new EU law requires ESMA to say for the first time if rules for hedge funds and other alternative investments such as private equity in non-EU countries are as strict as those in the 28-country bloc.

A positive view means that asset managers based outside the EU get a "passport" to continue offering

services to investors across Europe, replacing a system of country-bycountry private placement authorisation

Hedge

ESMA also gave the green light to hedge funds from Canada, Guernsey, Japan, Cayman Islands, Jersey, Australia, and Switzerland, with provisos for some of them.

Preliminary

In a preliminary finding, ESMA had not been able to recommend equivalence for the United States, the world's biggest hedge fund centre, because of competition concerns.

Nintendo's market cap doubles since Pokemon GO launch

JAPAN - Shares of Japan's Nintendo Co (7974.T) soared another 14 percent yesterday, more than doubling the firm's market capitalisation to 4.5 trillion yen (\$42.5 billion) in just seven sessions since the mobile game Pokemon GO was launched in the United States.

The phenomenal success of Pokemon GO - now available in 35 countries, the majority in Europe, and most recently in Canada - has triggered massive buying in Nintendo shares, surprising even some seasoned market players.

"I've never seen the trend of such a big company's shares changing so quickly in such a short period of time," said Takashi Oba, senior strategist at Okasan Securities.

Shares

Nintendo shares ended yesterday up 14.4 percent at 31 770 yen, bringing its gains to more than 100 percent since the launch

of the game on July 6.

Turnover in Nintendo shares hit 703.6 billion yen, surpassing the record for trading turnover in individual shares it set on Friday, of 476 billion yen.

SoftBank's Son challenges investors to 'feel the force'



SWEDEN - Swedish truckmaker Volvo (VOLVb.ST) reported better than expected second-quarter earnings yesterday as cost cuts and rising European sales helped fortify it against slumping US demand for commercial vehicles.

Heavy-duty trucks, where Volvo is competing with Germany's Daimler (DAIGn.DE) and Volkswagen (VOWG_p.DE), are benefiting from strong demand across Europe while battling downturns across the Atlantic.

Volvo, which sells trucks under the Mack, Renault and UD brands as well as its own name, scaled back its outlook for North America, saying it expected industry wide sales of 240 000 trucks, down from a forecast for 250 000 given in April.

Weaker markets in the United
States and also China, where sales of
construction equipment are falling,



will test the new leadership team's skill in boosting profitability.

Improvement

"In the second quarter we were able to continue the improvement of our underlying profitability despite declining sales, thanks to positive cost development," said CEO Martin Lundstedt, a former Scania boss appointed last year. Scania had long boasted some of the best profit mar-

gins in the business.

Gothenburg-based Volvo said order intake of its trucks fell eight percent in the second quarter compared with a one percent drop seen by analysts. A 29 percent fall in North American truck orders led the decline.

Volvo shares rose 0.8 percent by 0756 GMT (03:56 a.m. EDT), outpacing a 0.7 percent fall in the in the STOXX Europe 600 Industrial Goods and Services Index .SXNP. The stock is up 12 percent so far this year compared with a two percent drop for the index.

"The earnings are really good, and what stands out is primarily the 10 percent operating margin in trucks despite them scaling back output in North America," Handelsbanken Capital Markets analyst Hampus Engellau said. "This is exactly what one wanted to see."

MTN shares nosedive on profit warning

JOHANNESBURG Nigeria's mega fine on
mobile network MTN
[JSE:MTN] is still weighing
on the company as it warned
of forthcoming losses yesterday.

MTN told shareholders yesterday that it "expects to report negative basic headline earnings per share (HEPS) and basic earnings per share (EPS)" for the six months ended June 30. For the previous comparable period, MTN reported HEPS of 654 cents and EPS of 653 cents. The fall in earnings comes amid MTN having agreed to pay a 330 billion naira (R24.94bn) fine to the Nigerian government for its failure to register five million subscribers.

Amid the warning yesterday,

MTN shares fell over two percent to R137.80 at 09:49 in Johannesburg.

"The expected decline in the HEPS and EPS is primarily as a result of the Regulatory fine imposed on MTN Nigeria ('the Nigerian regulatory fine') following a resolution with the Federal Government of Nigeria on June 10, 2016," said MTN.

"The Nigerian regulatory fine is expected to have an estimated negative impact of 474 cents on HEPS and EPS, respectively," said MTN.

MTN further said it's been hit by "foreign exchange losses in a number of operations, losses from joint ventures and associates and hyperinflation adjustments on MTN Irancell". Fin24

DA TO PROTEST OUTSIDE PARLY OVER AXING OF SABC JOURNOS

JOHANNESBURG – The Democratic Alliance was expected to picket outside Parliament yesterday against the dismissal of four journalists by the SABC.

"The DA is appalled at the firing of four of the SABC 8 – Jacques Steenkamp, Krivani Pillay, Foeta Krige and Suna Venter. It would appear that the SABC staffers were fired for slighting SABC COO Hlaudi Motsoeneng's fragile ego by allegedly 'undermining the SABC and the authority of its management'," DA national spokeswoman Phumzile Van Damme said.

"It is clear that the wrecking ball that is Hlaudi Motsoeneng is going to continue smashing through the integrity of our country's public broadcaster, and do so with the tacit support of the ANC. As such, we



will be picketing for the reinstatement of these SABC staffers and for Parliament's intervention in the ongoing crisis at the SABC."

Planned

The DA initially planned a picket calling on the ANC's chief whip, Jackson Mthembu, to support its call for an urgent meeting of Parliament's portfolio committee on communications to consider the ongoing crisis at the SABC.

Van Damme said the DA would include a memorandum calling for

the reversal of the dismissals.

The memorandum would be delivered to the ANC offices in Parliament as well as the office of Communications Minister Faith Muthambi.

Safeguard

"The DA will continue to work tirelessly to safeguard media freedom and against the capture of the SABC by the ANC. We encourage the rest of South Africa to do the same," she said.

SABC like a kangaroo court in dismissing journalists - Union

JOHANNESBURG - Trade union Solidarity said yesterday that the battle lines were drawn on Monday night when the SABC dismissed four journalists with immediate effect and without disciplinary hearings.

"In my 20 years of involvement in labour relations I have not come across anything like this," Solidarity chief executive Dirk Hermann said in a statement. "It can be likened to a kangaroo court that executes an accused while an appeal process is still pending. In this instance, legal processes are being disregarded."

Dismissal

"The dismissal letters state that it is common knowledge that the journalists do not respect the SABC's management and that they would continue to undermine the SABC's authority and its management. According to the SABC, the journalists' behaviour is untenable and the

employment relationship has been terminated on 18 July,"

Solidarity said in a statement.
The SABC dismissed Foeta
Krige, Suna Venter, Krivani
Pillay and Jacques Steenkamp
after they were initially suspended

The public broadcaster also initiated disciplinary action against the four and four of their colleagues because they had allegedly distanced themselves from the SABC's censorship decision not to broadcast violence during protest actions.

"It is as if the SABC's executives believe that they are above
the law and that it would be of no
consequence," Hermann said.
"The battle lines have been clearly drawn and we are going to
involve the best top lawyers
available. We believe in the rule
of law and that unlawfulness

The ANC leader, Majaheni Nyalunga, who is a serving councillor in Mbombela's Ward 35, issued the warning, which was secretly recorded by a community member, last Tuesday.

"If there's one person who is [an independent] councillor, against 100 [ANC] people, where will she ask for the budget? Because she has to ask for it from us, and then we will [decide if we] give it to her. If she is not part of us, we definitely will not give it to her. If she is voted for and wins here, she will stay for five years and not a thing will happen here. That's the truth that we cannot dispute," Nyalunga is heard saying in the audio.

The main contenders for Ward 35 are the ANC's Reina Seepsop and independent candidate Elizabeth Mndawe. Both candidates are branch executive committee (BEC) members of the ANC. The ANC leaders in the province, however, opted for Seepsop while the community favoured Mndawe in a bizarre nomination process where voters were asked to whistle. The candidate who received the loudest whistles won the contest.

Public Protector 'shocked and appalled' by office invasion

JOHANNESBURG - "Traumatised staff" working under Public Protector Thuli Madonsela are receiving counselling following the "acts of a bunch of rascals that invaded her office" on Monday.

In a statement yesterday, Madonsela said she was "shocked and appalled" after the "group stormed the office and overpowered security personnel stationed at the entrance, jumping over the front desk to gain access to the rest of the building".

Reports said the protesters were from the Black First, Land First movement who were unhappy about an apartheid-era spy issue.

"Police were called in and the situation was defused, with members of the group being apprehended," the statement said.

"The Public Protector believes that such an illegal violent act, which allegedly included intimidation of staff



and taking at least four of them as hostages, should be condemned in the strongest possible terms by all those committed to constitutional democracy and the rule of law."

Unruly

Madonsela said "the unruly group is not complainants in the matter provided as a basis for their actions but have recently started inquiring about an investigation lodged by advocate Paul Hoffman of the Institute for Accountability Southern Africa".

"It is important to point out that the investigation is not and could not look into any apartheid crime of theft or any other as that would fall outside the remit of the Public Protector," the statement added.

Govt, traditional leaders must stop albino muti murders - ANCWL

JOHANNESBURG - The African National Congress Women's League (ANCWL) yesterday said it "is dismayed by myths that muti made with the body parts of people with albinism can make the user wealthy".

The league made the statement to

"applaud the traditional healer in Manguzi in Kwazulu-Natal who blew the whistle after he was allegedly approached by a woman who wanted to sell him a child...with albinism".

Media reports earlier this month said the healer, James Mthembu, had tipped off police after the woman offered him the child, who had been missing since June 28, for R100,000. She was arrested by Empangeni police.

The ANCWL's Matuba said the "Bill of Rights in the Constitution of South Africa...enshrines the rights of all people in our country and affirms the democratic values of human dignity, equality and freedom".

Cruel

"These rights are for all people, including people with albinism," she noted. "Our government must work with traditional leaders and the community at large to put an end to this cruel, barbaric practice. Anyone who is involved in this barbaric cruel acts must face full wrath of law." *Times live*

More needed in the fight against AIDS - Ramaphosa

DURBAN - While much had been achieved in the fight against HIV/Aids there was still much that needed to be done, South African deputy president Cyril Ramaphosa said on Monday.

'ALTHOUGH I LOST HER, SHE CONTINUES TO LIVE ON':

MOTHER DONATES LATE DAUGHTER'S EART TO ANOTHER GIRL

CUMBRIA - Losing her daughter in a car crash at the age of seven was unbearable for her mother.

Yet Debbie Stoner found a way for her little girl Jade to live on after taking the courageous decision to donate her organs to save the lives

Now, for the first time, her mother has met Nellie-Mai, the new-born girl who received it, and listened to her daughter's heart beating in her body.

"The first time I'd heard Jade's heart beating was when I was pregnant with her at my ultrasound scan and it sounded just as strong," she

"I knew her heart was no longer Jade's because she's no longer with us but it was a part of her.

"Although I lost the most precious thing in my life, she is continuing to live on, in a way."

Nellie-Mai Evans was born with cardiomyopathy and doctors feared she wouldn't pull through after she had a series of heart attacks.

Abandoned by her parents and struggling for life, doctors asked volunteer foster parents Jeff and Sarah Evans to sit with her so she wouldn't die alone.

Transplant

Mr Evans, 53, and his 42-year-old wife, from Cumbria, overheard doctors saying that without a family Nellie-Mai couldn't be put on the transplant list so they immediately decided to foster her.

The Evans have now adopted Nellie-Mai, who has learning difficulties and severe epilepsy.

At the same time, almost 300 miles away in Dorset, seven-yearold Jade died after being knocked offher bike by a car.

Her mother and father John, from Christchurch, Dorset, decided to donate her daughter's organs in the hope they might give life to others.

Four people - two adults and two babies - received Jade's organs. Nellie-Mai, 11, received Jade's

heart in 2006 and immediately started to thrive.

Although the involved families are not supposed to have contact, Nellie-Mai's foster father, a retired



police detective, managed to track Jade's parents down after reading about Jade's death in a newspaper.

Ten years on, the families met. At the meeting, the Evans' offered Mrs Spooner the chance to hear her daughter's heartbeat

"It was something I assumed she'd want to do but maybe she didn't want to ask,' Mrs Evans said.

"I didn't want her to leave and not hear it. When I asked her, she put her hands to her face, started crying and said: 'Are you sure?'

"I was pleased we could do it because thank you will never be enough."

Worst

Talking about the Mrs Stoner, 45, said: "It's the worst time of your life when a family member dies, and even worse when it's your own child - it's heart-breaking and unbearable.

"But I get a lot of positivity from knowing that thanks to Jade, other children have been given a life. I miss Jade every day, but I know I made the right decision.

"Thanks to Jade, two babies have grown up with a life, so her death wasn't in vain. Through Nellie, Jade is still living."

Mrs Stoner said it was 'fate' that Nellie-Mai had received her daughter's heart as they share many quali-

"Nellie was just so caring and loving, just like Jade was,' her mother, who has a daughter Amy, 14, and son Ben, six, added.

"I'd do anything to have Jade

back, but there was nothing that could be done to save her - seeing Nellie in the flesh and seeing how thriving she is helped so much.

"As sad and painful as it was losing Jade, it was fate and it was meant to be.

"Nellie is still poorly, but whatever happens with her in the future, I'm so pleased she had a chance to live and that Jade gave her the chance."

Mrs Stoner added that it was difficult to make the decision to donate Jade's organs.

Donate

"Initially Jade's dad said he didn't want to donate her heart, because she was all heart and he didn't want people pulling her apart and taking parts of her body - he wanted her kept whole,' she said.

"But I said she was seven years old - she was healthy and there was nothing wrong with her, so maybe we should think about it.

"In the end we both came to the same conclusion - she was so giving and loved helping people, so I like to think she would've wanted us to do it."

Nellie-Mai's father Jeff recalled the moment he saw his daughter after she received Jade's heart.

"We watched the harvesting team carrying Jade's heart into the hospital," he said.

"It was all very surreal, and we were both scared. Nel was so horrendously ill, and we couldn't fathom how such a complex medical procedure was ever going to succeed.




"When it was over and we were allowed in to see her I got a shock - prior to the transplant

MINYA - Egyptian officials say a Muslim mob stabbed a Coptic Christian to death over a personal feud. Bishop Macarious of the southern Minya governorate says the group attacked the families of two priests with knives and batons in the village of Tahna al-Gabal late on Sunday. Fam Khalaf, 27, was killed and the father of one of the priests was wounded. Police confirmed the incident and said they arrested four people. Christian residents gathered at a local church for prayers for the dead and protests.

Maximum dollar resale in Nigeria

LAGOS - Nigerian currency dealers have introduced a maximum resale premium on dollar trades on the interbank market to boost liquidity after the naira touched a record low in thin trade. The naira traded without a pre-determined premium - or spread - on Friday, a trader at one of the 15 primary market dealers, told Reuters. Traders under the umbrella of the Financial Market Dealers Association (FMDA) set the spread at a ceiling of 0.50 naira per dollar on Monday, he said.



Politicians try break deadlock

BENGHAZI - Libyan rival politicians are meeting in Tunisia to search for a way to break the deadlock in the country's crisis, including changes to the UN-brokered road map for its political future. Libya is split between rival governments and parliaments based in the western and eastern regions, each backed by different militias and tribes.

'PROLONGED STAY IN ADDIS WON'T HURT ANC PRESIDENTIAL BID'

JOHANNESBURG - African **Union Commission** Chairperson Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma said on Monday her prolonged stay in Addis Ababa would not affect her possible campaign for the ANC presidency.

She was due to finish her term as AU Commission chair in October, but AU leaders meeting in Kigali, Rwanda, were unable to agree on a replacement on Monday. So they asked her to stay on until January when new elections would be held at the next AU summit in Addis Ababa for the chair and all other members of the AU Commission.

"Of course my term should have ended in October, but the way I look at it is that I'd come to serve the continent and if the continent has challenges, and they

want me to stay an additional six months, I should do it, and do it with pleasure," Dlamini-Zuma told journalists after the summit ended. On the possible impact of

her delayed return to South Africa on the presidential bid she is widely speculated to be planning, she said: "No this has got nothing to do with the ANC. The

ANC has its own processes. "And in any case, the conference is December 2017," she added, laughing.

Replace

Earlier, the AU leaders held an election for a new AU Commission chairperson to replace her, but none of the three candidates won the two-third majority required by AU rules, said outgoing AU Chairperson

Idriss Deby, president of Chad. The three candidates were Botswana's Foreign Affairs Minister Pelonomi Venson-Moitoi, representing southern Africa, Equatorial Guinean Foreign Minister Agapito Mba Mokuy representing central Africa, and former Ugandan vice-president Specioza Naigaga Wandira Kazibwe representing east Africa. Four police officers charged with murder in Kenya

NAIROBI - A Kenyan High Court charged four police officers on Monday with murder over what human rights groups say were the extra-judicial killings of an activist lawyer, his client and their driver in late June.

Rights groups said they believed foul play was behind the deaths of the three and demanded an investigation into that and other allegations of police corruption and heavy-handed tactics.

The four defendants -Frederick Leliman, Leonard Maina, Stephen Morogo and Silvia Wanjohi - pleaded not guilty on Monday, court documents showed.

Accused

They are accused of killing rights lawyer Willie Kimani and his client Josephat Mwendwa, and their taxi driver Joseph Muiruri on June 23. The three disappeared after Kimani and Mwendwa made a court appearance.

Kimani and Mwendwa had

filed a complaint alleging that Mwendwa had been shot and injured by police in April.

After lodging the complaint, Mwendwa was charged with a range of offences, including possessing drugs and resisting arrest, according to rights activists.

The four police officers were remanded in custody until August 16 when they are to reappear in court and allowed to apply for bail. Reuters

Buhari fears delays in corruption trials

ABUJA - Nigeria's President Muhammadu Buhari said he was concerned about delays in prosecuting former public officials for corruption, warning it could harm his highprofile stance on graft.

"I am worried that the expectation of the public is yet to be met by the judiciary with regard to the removal of delay and the toleration of delay tactics by lawyers," he said.

"When cases are not concluded the negative impression is given that crime pays," Buhari told a summit examining the role of the judiciary in the overall drive against corruption.

"This certainly needs to change if we are to make success in our collective effort in the fight against corruption."

Change

Buhari, who was elected last year on a platform to tackle graft, has said "mind-boggling" sums of public funds were stolen over decades and has made recovering the money a central plank of his presidency.

ZIMBABWEAN STILL NOT PAID

HARARE - Zimbabwe has delayed paying its soldiers for a second successive month, sources said Monday, underlining the worsening economic crisis that has triggered recent protests.

Ten days ago, President Robert Mugabe's government was shaken by a national strike led by civil servants frustrated over several salary delays as Zimbabwe's treasury struggles with a severe cash shortage.

The military are normally the first priority for payment due to their role in protecting the regime of Mugabe, 92.

MELANIA TRUMP HIT BY SPEECH PLAGIARISM CONTROVERSY

CLEVELAND – Portions of
Melania Trump's prime-time
speech to the Republican
National Convention on
Monday appear to have been
plagiarised, tarnishing what
should have been her big
moment to introduce herself to
the American public.

The apparent plagiarism came to light shortly after the 46-year-old former model took to the stage with husband Donald Trump on Monday night, to offer an eloquent testimonial of his strengths as a husband, father, and potential leader of the United States.

A section of the speech describing the values that shaped her life strongly resembled a passage from Michelle Obama's speech to the 2008 Democratic convention.

"My parents impressed on me the values: that you work hard for what you want in life. That

your word is your bond and you do what you say and keep your promise.

That you treat people with respect. They taught me to show the values and morals in my daily life. That is the lesson that I continue to pass along to our son," Melania Trump said.

"And we need to pass those lessons on to the many generations to follow. Because we want our children in this nation to know that the only limit to your achievements is the strength of your dreams and your willingness to work for them."

Johnson to make first US trip for ISIS talks

LONDON - New British Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson will tomorrow make his first official visit to the US, meeting international counterparts as part of the fight against Islamic State (IS).

The former London mayor, a surprise choice to become Britain's top diplomat in new Prime Minister Theresa May's government, made his first overseas engagement on Monday, meeting with European leaders, many of whom were angered by his campaign to take Britain out of the EU.

Johnson will meet with US counterpart John Kerry in London yesterday to "underline the importance of the special relationship following Britain's decision to withdraw from the European Union".

He will then host a meeting of counterparts from Germany, France and Italy, and the EU High Representative to discuss the conflict in Syria. AFP



Iran nuke programme to ease

VIENNA - A document obtained by The Associated Press shows that key restrictions on Iran's nuclear programme will ease in slightly more than a decade, halving the time Tehran would need to build a bomb. The document is the only secret text linked to last year's agreement between Iran and six foreign powers. It says that after a period between 11 to 13 years, Iran can replace its 5 060 inefficient centrifuges with up to 3 500 advanced machines.

German police kill Afghan teen

BERLIN - German police shot dead a 17-year-old Afghan refugee on Monday after he attacked train passengers with an axe and a knife, seriously wounding four in what one official said was a "probable" Islamist attack. Several other people were also injured in the assault on a regional train near the southern city of Wuerzburg, police said, adding that the teenager was killed as he tried to flee. Joachim Herrmann, the interior minister of Bavaria state, said the assailant had arrived as an unaccompanied minor in Germany and had lived at first in a shelter and then more recently with a foster family in nearby Ochsenfurt."

Ex army captain dies in prison riot

GUATEMALA CITY – A former army captain convicted of murdering a Guatemalan bishop was killed on Monday in a prison riot in which 13 people died, the National Institute of Forensic Sciences said. A spokesman for the institute said the death of Byron Lima Oliva, who was serving 20 years for the murder of Bishop Juan Gerardi in 1998, took place in Pavoncito, a prison 18 miles (30 km) from the capital, Guatemala City.

Kidnapped Pakistani judge's son found bound in chains

KARACH - Pakistani soldiers rescued the kidnapped son of a senior judge from his Taliban captors yesterday, after finding him bound in chains with his mouth taped shut and wearing in an all-enveloping burqa to hide his identity, the army spokesman said.

Awais Shah, the son of Sindh provincial Chief Justice Sajjad Ali Shah, was kidnapped from outside a supermarket in the southern port city of Karachi on June 21.

Shah was found in the backseat of a car in a town bordering the northwestern tribal areas.

Army spokesman General Asim Bajwa said three "terrorists" were killed during the rescue, adding that the kidnappers belonged to a splinter faction of the Tehreek-eTaliban Pakistan (TTP).

Bajwa told reporters the operation took place at approximately 2 a.m. near the town of Tank, when the kidnappers were transporting Shah, possibly with a view to transferring him to Afghanistan.

Tank, a town in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province on the border with the South Waziristan tribal area, is approximately 885 km (550 miles) north of Karachi.

Television footage showed Shah reunited with his family at their Karachi home. Shah's father said he did not know which group kidnapped his son.

"I don't know anything other than that my child has been returned to me," he said.



JOSE MOURINHO UNH AT EPL FIXTURE SCHEDUL

MANCHESTER - The Premier League would not sanction a postpenement of Manchester United's October trip to Chelsea should Jose Mourinho request it amid Europa League commitments.

United's manager is said to be frustrated at a lack of preparation time before their clash at Stamford Bridge on the weekend of October 22/23.

It is scheduled for Saturday (October 22) but likely to be played a day later (October 23) given Europa League group fixtures on the Thursday (October 20).

That leaves a three-day rest period

... but Premier League will turn down any attempt to postpone clash

and Sportsmail understands that United have not contacted the Premier League and postponing is out of the question regardless.

Antonio Conte's side are planning an assault on the title and it is doubtful they would agree to such a move given the likelihood of the two clubs being top of the table rivals.

Despite Mourinho's disappointment, United know the complications of the fixture list and are set to

Playing Thursday and Sunday is common practice for teams in Europe's secondary competition. The potential for pushing back until Monday October 24 is highly unlikely given the League Cup fourth round matches that week.

Mourinho is irked that Chelsea will enjoy a full week off prior to their game.

'Xhaka the perfect signing for Arsenal'

LONDON - Per Mertesacker expects Granit Xhaka to set the tempo from the Arsenal engine room this season and described him as the "perfect signing" for the club.

The 23-year-old, who joined Arsenal in May, captained Borussia Moenchengladbach to fourth place last season and also helped Switzerland reach the last 16 of the Euro 2016.

British media reported Xhaka's transfer fee at about 30 million pounds (\$43.95 million), which would make the midfield enforcer Arsenal's third most expensive signing behind Mesut Ozil and Alexis Sanchez.

"He's a leader and that is really

important, especially in midfield. He has got a very good attitude, is very composed on the ball and contributes a lot," Mertesacker told the club's website (www.arsenal.com).

"He is a good passer as well, so he will set the tempo. I am looking forward to how he does it, how composed he will be in training and in the games.

"He will be the perfect signing for us."

Francis Coquelin, who played 26 league games last campaign, said Arsenal needed to dig deep in big games and must pay closer attention to details in order to push for the title after finishing second to champions Leicester City. Reuters

Stoke City bid £20m for Saido Berahino

STOKE - Stoke City have made a £20million bid for West Bromwich Albion striker Saido Berahino.

The 22-year-old is also a target for Crystal Palace after turning down the chance to sign a new four-year contract at the Hawthorns.

The offer is an increase on the £16m

offered last month and closer to the bid Stoke put in in January.

Berahino only has one year left on contract but West Brom, who are continuing talks over a takeover, value him at £22million. Sportsmail revealed earlier in July however that Berahino is happy to stay at West Brom next season if his future isn't finalised by the end of the July. The striker does not want to be involved in another saga and if he is not sold by the end of the month he will be fully focused on the season ahead. Albion have also had a £9m bid for left-sided Leicester defender Jeffrey Schlupp rejected. Daily Mail

New-boy Ibrahimovic to miss China tour

MANCHESTER - Zlatan Ibrahimovic will miss Manchester United's pre-season tour of China as the Sweden striker takes an extended break following Euro 2016.

Ibrahimovic joined Jose Mourinho's side on a free transfer after leaving French champions Paris Saint Germain at the end of last season, but the Premier League club's legion of fans in

China won't get a first glimpse of the marquee signing in a United shirt.

CHILEAN FOOTBALLERS VOTE TO STRIKE, MATCHES CALLED OFF

CHILLI - Chile's footballers have voted to go on strike, forcing the start of the league season to be postponed.

The players' union SIFUP is unhappy at a decision to reduce promotion and relegation in the new season, a move which it says has cost 120 players their jobs in the top two divisions.

It has also complained about unpaid wages at some clubs. "The professional players unanimously decided to follow the call to stop the national championship," said SIFUP in a statement. The Chilean FA (ANFP) has ruled that only one team will be relegated and one team promoted between the top tier, known as the Primera Division, and second tier, known as the Primera B, at the end of the 2016/17 season.

Meanwhile, there will be no promotion or relegation at all

between the second and third tier, known as the Segunda.

SIFUP said the decision had "reduced the competitiveness of the domestic tournaments, where the clubs, who do not see themselves as threatened in case of a poor campaign, have drastically cut the costs of their squads."

It said that 120 players had seen their contracts terminated in the top two tiers and 300 in the third tier.

The ANFP confirmed that the start of the season at the weekend would be postponed and said the reduced promotion and relegation was for the upcoming season only.

"We regret SIFUP's decision to ratify the strike, a situation which will have negative efforts on the championship, the fans, the players and the sport in general," it said. *Timeslive*

MURRAY PULLS OUT OF TORONTO EVENT TO FOCUS ON RIO



LONDON - Wimbledon champion Andy Murray has pulled out of next week's Rogers Cup in Toronto so he can give his body time to rest before he sets out in defence of his Olympic singles title at the Rio Games.

Britain's Murray won his third Rogers Cup title last year in

Montreal but the defending champion said after reaching the final round in each of his last five events, that he needed to take some time off.

"My body needs some recovery, time after reaching the latter stages of tournaments over the past few months," Murray, who is second in the world rankings, said in a statement released by Tennis Canada. "I'm sorry to my fans in Toronto but I look forward to being back in Canada next year."

Murray's decision marks the first time the three-times grand slam champion has skipped the Canadian event since his first appearance in 2006.

The Rogers Cup will run from July 23-31 and the tennis competition at the Rio Olympics will be held from August 6 to 14.

But he lasted just 10 months in Manchester before being sacked after a dismal run of form, which eventually saw them miss out of Champions League qualification. Daily Mail


Ex-Springbok Lofty Nel passes away

SWEDISH FREE-SKIER DIES IN CHILE AVALANCHE

Rapaport, who was 30 years old, was skiing during a film shoot outside the resort town of Farellones last Thursday after a major snowstorm when the avalanche occurred. She died later in hospital after suffering oxygen deprivation and brain damage.

"Matilda was an extraordinary

athlete, traveling the world to find her passion, ride steep terrain and share her bright smile," Red Bull said in a statement. Rapaport was an established part of the freeride skiing circuit, in which athletes rapidly descend steep, rocky mountain faces, and she had appeared in many ski films and magazines.

Her death occurred nearly two years after the Chilean avalanche deaths of famed extreme skiers Jean-Philippe Auclair, a Canadian, and Carl Andreas Fransson, a Swede.



BIRDS' LEGEND 'SPARROW' HONGWANE DIES

- He died yesterday morning after an undisclosed illness
- Family and friends shattered, mum on his death
- Played for Mbabane Swallows and Sihlangu, retired in 1987

SOCCER - ANOTHER huge loss to local football, Mbabane Swallows have lost one of their legendary players in Thabo 'Sparrow' Hongwane, who passed away yesterday after an undisclosed illness.

Hongwane was confirmed dead after going for medical attention at one of the doctors around Mbabane.

According to a source close to the matter, Hongwane was very unstable when he arrived at the doctor's offices as early as 7:30am. He was driving alone in a Nissan car and is said to have been leaning against the wall while making his way to the doctor's offices. Upon arriving at the offices, he was offered a chair by the security guard, who was also found at the scene, to sit and wait for the doctor, who usually shows up at 9am.

"Fortunately the doctor arrived just after 8am and Hongwane was helped inside the patientroom by him (security guard) and a cleaner.

Another source, who works with the doctor, said she arrived at work after 8am and was instructed to call the health emergency ser-

show up hastily and after about 15 minutes after the doctor had attended the patient, he was declared dead.

"The deceased had difficulty breathing and his chest was making a loud and peculiar sound. He wanted to talk but no words were coming out, he then started to shout outrageously," explained the source. His family was contacted and seemingly they were around town as they quickly showed up, unfortunately he had passed on.

"I browsed through his phone and went to the last number he dialled and made a call.

Fortunately it was her niece on the other side and I narrated the ordeal and she quickly showed up with

another male relative but the deceased had already been taken by an ambulance on their arrival."

A family member, who preferred to speak on condition of anonymity confirmed the death of Hongwane but did not elaborate on the matter, citing that they were yet to inform the elders of the family, who were currently out of the

"I cannot say much because as a family we are yet to meet and inform the elders. If things would go my way, I would ask that you do not even publish it because I am not sure how the other family members would react upon seeing this article about the passing away of 'Sparrow'."

We have lost a true legend - Swallows

SOCCER - Mbabane Swallows, through the team's CEO Sibusiso Manana have mourned the death of the legendary Thabo 'Sparrow' Hongwane.

Manana described Hongwane as an all-rounder, playing every position there was in the field of play. Manana said he lacked the words to describe the enormous talent the former 'Birds' legend possessed.

"This is a very sad moment for the team; we have

lost one of the greatest talents Mbabane Swallows have ever had. As a team, we would like to

send our deepest condolences to the Hongwane family in these trying times. May the Lord comfort and be with the Hongwane family, friends and relative as this dark hour," he said.

BRIEF HISTORY

The name Thabo 'Sparrow' Hongwane sent shivers down the spine of many a defender in the early to mid-1980s. The former Sihlangu striker, who terrorised defenders in the famed red and white Mbabane Swallows jersey was a prolific goal poacher, who played alongside other departed greats like Ronnie 'Valiant' Dube, Pius 'Mkhari' Dube, Sipho Bhengu and other living 'Birds' legends like Wilfred Maria Maria Fakudze, Rueben 'Pele' Mncina, Differ 'Different Strokes' Maphanga, Mlamuli 'Sputla' Zwane, LLoyd 'Magic Feet' Maziya and others. He also played alongside his brother at Swallows, goalkeeper Styles Hongwane before calling it a day and hanging up his golden

The lanky attacker was recruited and snatched by the then money spinning Denver Sundowns shortly after his return from a very brief stint in South Africa.

In his absence while in SA, his team, Swallows snatched the inaugural BP Cup in 1986 beating Manzini Wanderers 4-2 in a tightly contested final in front of a packed Somhlolo crowd. The father to Manzini Sundowns striker Delisa Hongwane played in arguably one of the most stylish Swallows sides and formed a lethal partnership with another late 'Birds' legend, former captain marvel Gift 'Cracker' Masina. He retired from active playing around 1987.

HONGWANE'S FINAL MOMENTS
