





WOMEN WITH SUGAR DIABETES GO THROUGH BITTER, PAINFUL SEX

IN a rather startling revelation, **Swaziland Diabetes Association Director and Founder Dumisile** Mavuso revealed that sex is extremely painful for women who have sugar diabetes.

She said it was quite laborious such that it could leave women with injuries similar to those rape victims

Most diabetic women do not even know that they have intimacy issues caused by the disease hence for many women it remains a silent problem that goes undiagnosed and untreated

would suffer.

"When you say diabetes and sexual dysfunction, people automatically think it's a men's only problem. Women with diabetes can also have sexual problems related to their sugar

levels," she said during a conference at Bulembu. She said women with diabetes would suffer from painful sex caused by the lack of natural virginal lubrication.

Mavuso said the lack of lubrication

could impact a woman's sex life negatively and would further make sexual intercourse uncomfortable.

She said a diabetic woman would sustain painful bruises, sores and horrible yeast infections causing uncontrollable itching where women would be seen even scratching uncontrollably in public.

"During foreplay, a man can be shocked to find his partner still dry, this often causes men to think negatively about their partners and other lovers could be tempted to be promiscuous," she

said. Mavuso said it would take quite sometime for women with diabetes to admit they had a problem in bed due to the lack of

public awareness on the matter.

She noted that the local medical community had also been slow to study the issue of sexual dysfunction in women.

"Most diabetic women do not even know that they have intimacy issues caused by the disease. For many women it remains a silent problem that goes undiagnosed and untreated," she said.

PAC shocked cops who stole fines money still employed

PARLIAMENTARIANS are shocked that police officers who looted public funds two years ago are still employed by the police service.

The police officers helped themselves on taxpayers' money, brazenly stealing various amounts held in their custody. Police National Commissioner Isaac Magagula's explanation that these thieving officers have already been charged with various criminal counts for their wayward actions could not convince the Public Accounts Committee yesterday.

The PAC is an oversight parliamentary committee looking into the expenditures of government ministries so as to ascertain if the money that was budgeted for and allocated to the departments was eventually spent appropriately.

In terms of government budgetary principles, it is an offence on the part of a department to either under-spend or overspend. This parliamentary committee, therefore, ensured on behalf of the taxpaying citizens in particular and the nation in general that public funds are not misappropriated. Appointed MP Thuli Dladla chairs the committee.

Manzini South MP Owen Nxumalo told Magagula that police officers were so deeply involved in corrupt activities so much that they surpassed civilian criminal gangs.

MP Nxumalo wondered what happened to the discipline they so much loved to proclaim in their quest to appear as a disci-

plined force in the eyes of the unsuspecting public.

"Clearly, lapha kuka machancha nje, where people siphon public funds willy-nilly without any controls," decried Nxumalo. Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe, a former police officer himself, demanded answers from the national commissioner why it took so long for the Royal Swaziland Police Service to get rid of these criminal elements?

Masquerading

At the very least, MP Shongwe wanted to know why were these criminal suspects masquerading as police officers not being suspended. Shongwe said during his days as a cop, the involvement of a police officer in criminal cases was unheard of and, in the event any officer was fingered of any wrong doing, the leadership at the time did not hesitate to fire that officer.

Magagula was at pains trying to explain that the proverbial long arm of the law has already caught up with these suspected officers.

He told MP Shongwe that the dark days when managers were law unto themselves and had the liberty to fire people on the spot

CORRUPT COP STEALS E400 000

A corrupt police officer, as part of the looting of public funds, stole E414 000 over a period of two years.

Police National Commissioner Isaac Magagula told members of the PAC on its first sitting yesterday that the actions of this particular officer indicated that he worked for himself.

Magagula told stunned members of the PAC the thieving officer would wake up every morning to collect money from the public, which all ended up meeting his greedy needs.

Structures

Magagula said they had dealt with the officer internally using their structures and further charged him with criminal counts that

he would face in a court of law in due course. Most of the money was collected as traffic fines in various roadblocks

Deposit

The auditor general said the police officer took general receipt books from Matata, which he used to collect the money, but did not deposit it to a government revenue office.

He said these lawless officers, whom he chose to describe in vernacular as emanyokololo, were just some of the challer they faced in the police service.

Treasury department short-staffed

ACTING Accountant General Elizabeth Matsebula has told the PAC her department is short-staffed and has no officers to conduct regional inspections.

She said the department had five such officers but had to be redeployed to perform other assignments due to increased workload within the department. She said to salvage the crisis situation, government had to engage experienced retired accountants on a temporary basis. With the involvement of the retired officers, Matsebula said they were now able to make quarterly visits countrywide as part of their inspections.

Accountant General to partner with Tinkhundla

THE accountant general's office is in the process of partnering with the ministry of tinkhundla administration and development to decentralise its services.

Acting Accountant General Elizabeth Matsebula told the PAC that the intention was to increase efficiency in the collection of public funds. Not only do they want to increase efficiency, but they want to reduce the rampant loss of public funds as well. She said they were currently introducing a public finance management system that would make it easier for them to introduce other forms of revenue collection. She said service providers had already submitted their proposals and were now being considered. The new models of payment may include collecting money electronically.

MEMBERS of the Swaziland Association of Savings and Credit Cooperatives (SASCCO) have to find a way of getting E186 million to finish off the project they started

SASCCO is an umbrella organisation of savings and credit cooperatives in the country. The organisation embarked on a project in which it erected a building 14 years ago.

The building is situated in Mbabane, just above Emaphalwini Mall, which is otherwise known as the new mall. It remains unfinished until now.

It has been turned into a sex den and haven for anything illegal.

The building was supposed to encompass a cooperative bank, conference facility, office tower and a parking space.

SASCCO President James Nkambule told the members of the cooperative societies that the state of affairs in which the project found itself in was caused by many problems, which were sometimes out of their control as members.

He was speaking yesterday during the SASCCO Indaba, which was held at Esibayeni Lodge in Matsapha. He was presenting on the state of the project.

Nkambule said at times, the building would be found to be encroaching in other people's lands.

He made an example of an incident where they had a misunderstanding with owners of the new mall, where they had found themselves having encroached into their space.

"When we proposed to them that we buy the piece of their land which we had occupied, they told us they were not ready to sell that piece, but they were ready to sell the whole mall," Nkambule said.

Another problem that SASCCO had was that they could not get financing from the banks because they, as

Investors to profit in 20 years

INVESTORS in the SASCCO building project stand to gain returns on their investments in a period of about 20 to 30 years if they continue to finish the pro-

This was revealed by SASCCO President James Nkambule. He said this would only be the case if they decided to rejuvenate the whole project and include other things that were not included when the project was conceived.

The rejuvenated project would cost an amount of E600 million. That is when the investors in the project, which include members of the savings and credit cooperatives, would stand a chance of gaining the

Nkambule did not, however, give a specific amount of time to expect returns if the project was to be taken from where it was now. He said if they decided to continue with it as it was, they would have to fork out E186 million but he did not know when the returns on investments would be gotten.

Nkambule, however, said there was hope as he did highlight that organisations like government did have demand for office space, which meant chances were there that they would gain some returns, but not anytime soon.

SASCCO, also wanted to build a

That cooperative bank of SASCCO was viewed as competition to commercial banks. In the eyes of the commercial banks, it made no sense to finance a venture that would be a competition to them.

Amount

SASCCO was supposed to raise an amount of E30 million to carry out the project, according to Nkambule.

This amount was supposed to be raised from the members, who were about 25 000 at that time. They had targeted at least 15 000 members of the savings and credit cooperatives. Each of the 15 000 members, he said, had to fork out at least E2 000 to see the project through.

The cooperatives had to raise the E30 million within a space of 18 months. Within that period of time, the cooperatives had been able to raise E25 million.

He said this showed that the mem-

bers had the capacity to finish off the project on their own. The project however, had stalled because of various impediments.

Liabilities

The figure needed (E186 million), is a result of the liabilities they accumulated when the project was stalled.

He made an example of the money they borrowed from the De Bank of Southern Africa (DBSA), which was E42 million.

The project was not registered under SASCCO. A new company was formed and it is known as Kwakitsi Investments (Pty) Ltd.

The problem that is said to have arisen concerning the members of the savings and credit cooperatives.

It was revealed yesterday that some savings and credit cooperatives would want to have permanent seats in the board of Kwakitsi Investments because they were contributors to the project.

... Project accumulates E97 million in liabilities

building project has come as a blow to the members of SASC-CO as they now find themselves having to deal with the E97.2 million the project has now accumulated in liabilities.

The accumulation has been caused by the fact that the project has stopped for about 14 years

The accumulated figure is a result of accrued interest on top of loans the organisation secured through various financial institu-

SASCCO secured a loan from DBSA which was E25 million at the time the project was worked

The reason they had to borrow that money was because of the problems the organisations had encountered where they had to fork out for costs, like having to pay the mall, whose land they were accused of encroaching. Other liabilities included money they owed the contractor of the building, which was E22.7 mil-

Professional fees were up to E5 million, while SASCCO loans were up to E3.5 million. Encroachment fees amounted to

E1 million and members' contributions amounted to E23 million. The total amount of this is E97.2

SASCCO President James Nkambule noted that members had the capacity to finish off the structure on their own.

He told the members that their building was still fit for human

occupation, if it were finished.

"The evaluation process that was done on that building in 2010 tells us that the building is 60 percent complete and it costs about E64 million. That was in 2010," Nkambule said.

Nkambule said as a way forward, they could hold talks with government, so that it continues with the project, because government also had a huge demand for office space.

He also told the members that they could also liquidate the whole project because of the amount of money being owed to the above organisations.

Option

He said the option they wanted was to take up the project as members and finish it off. He said the members had the capaci-

The president reminded them that they were able to raise E25 million within a relatively short space of time so they could finish the project.

He said all that was needed was commitment and cooperation from the members.

Quoting the opening remarks of Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Gideon Dlamini. He said the minister implored them to be finders of solutions to every problems they faced.

The minister said we must not always talk about problems because doing so did not help, but we can talk about problems and then suggest solutions to those problems," Nkambule implored the members.

We also have a good rail system which will be complemented by plans in the region to construct a new railway line linking several countries in the region for ease of movement of goods," said.


The king said he was impressed with TECO's environmentally friendly products.


This is a facility you can also use to expand your diverse products as you venture into the African market," he said.

Plan for after life - Paul

ACTING Prime Minister Paul Dlamini has appealed to all Swazis to start thinking and planning for after life despite that it is hard to think of one own's death.

Dlamini was speaking during the trustee training on death beneficiary funds that was hosted by Fairlife Benefit Services Swaziland held at Sibane Hotel.

Dlamini said it was important to plan for afterlife so that one would not leave any confusion and fights after passing away.

He commended Fairlife for providing an information forum on governance of beneficiary funds.

"As enlightened citizens, we should not be self-centred and think as well as plan for ourselves only while we

"We should also plan for governance of our death benefits to show the difference between people who had the opportunity to learn about new development initiatives compared to those who are not exposed," he said.

He said the training would empower the trustees to understand their roles in handling beneficiary finances, the social responsibility of Fairlife and tracing the guardian of beneficiaries, children, parents and whoever stands to benefit.

'We commend Fairlife for recognising the need to empower both the public sector, which is His Majesty's government directors and the private sector. I thank the direct of Failife Benefit Services Swaziland for being instrumental on training Swazis on death benefits," he said.

Dlamini said government was fully committed in the administration of

death benefits and governance of beneficiary funds.

However, he said government alone could not do it thus it needed institutions like Fairlife to serve as an extended arm of government.

Dlamini warned families to be open and honest about such benefits so that the family members may be aware of such savings in case the worst hap-

He made an example of an instance where a man becomes very sick to a point that he can no longer talk, and the wife becomes so frustrated not knowing where she will get money to help save her husband yet the husband has some money stashed somewhere.

He then appealed to all companies to be transparent and make sure that what clients were promised when joining the policies, they get when it was time for a payouts. He called upon the relevant labour organisations to be more concerned about matters that touch on matters of the welfare of employees than on matters that do not concern

The pope said he was happy to be in the country as Swaziland had always been one of his favourite countries.

He revealed that the Greek community had been in the country for about 42 years now, and they had helped in various projects such as creating jobs for Swazis. He asked the government to provide them with land in the rural area so that they would build a school and a clinic.

"All over Africa, we have built 500 schools and 5 000 clinics and we would like to be allocated land in any rural area so we can build a school and a clinic. These will be of benefit to the less privileged populace. As the Greek Orthodox, helping is our priority," he said.

The Greek Pope further presented the acting prime minister with a number of books, which he said would enlighten him on the Greek Orthodox religion.

The Greek Pope and his delegation then proceeded to a baptism ceremony held at the church in Pine Valley.

At dawn on Monday May 9, 2016, His Beatitude Theodoros II, Pope and Patriarch of Alexandria and All Africa, arrived in Kenya, accompanied by the Reverend Protoprsbyter Athenodoros Papaevripiadis, Exarch of the Patriarchate in Cyprus where he performed the enthronements of the two new Bishops of Nyeri and Mount Kenya, Gis Grace Neophytos and Kisumu and Western Kenya His Grace Athanasios within the next few days.

He was welcomed by His Eminence Makarios Metropolitan of Nairobi, their Grace the two Bishops, the Ambassador of Greece Mr Konstantinos Moatsos, the Ambassador of Egypt to Kenya Kadri Abdel-Motelib, and many priests. His Beatitude the Pope revealed that when he left Kenya, there was so much rain, added that he would pray that the country experience the same thing.

Two-year-old found wandering at Nguyeyedvwa Mountain

THE Royal Swaziland Police Service is seeking help from the public mainly residents of and around Mbelekweni area in the Manzini region to help identify a toddler who was found wandering in the area's mountain last week Thursday.

The toddler, a boy, is suspected to be about two years old and he could not talk yet.

The toddler was found last Thursday at Nguyeyedvwa Mountain, seemingly in a confused state and wandering about. He was found by a 56-year-old man at about 1630 hrs.

The old man found the boy while herding his cattle in the mountain. The toddler was carrying a backpack which had a few of his clothing items.

The man then alerted the Manzini police who came and took the boy. He is currently kept at the Halfway House in Zakhele.

Family

Attempts to find the boy's family proved futile as families from around where he was found could not recognise him.

RSP Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba is appealing to the public to help identify the child so that he would be reunited with his family.

He said it was hard to ascertain what might have happened for the boy to end up in the mountain alone, as he is still too young to talk.

"There are many theories that come up if you look at the matter. The boy might have been dumped by someone seeing that he had a backpack with his items inside, or he might have lost his way somehow.

We just appeal to the public to help identify the child," he said. Anyone who might have any idea of the child's identity must contact the nearest police station or the PICO, Khulani Mamba.

Cops to pounce on ponzi scheme managers

WITH ponzi schemes mushrooming everywhere around the country promising unsuspecting Swazis to join with the hope of getting their money back with a higher interest, police are now investigating those pyramid schemes and the people behind them might find themselves behind bars.

This comes after a complaint against one local pyramid scheme was reported at Sigodvweni police station.

The police have since started investigating the matter and have vowed that those behind such schemes would face the wrath of the law. The name of the scheme which is under investigation was not revealed by the police as the investigations are still ongoing.

Deputy Police Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that a ponzi scheme matter has been reported with the Matsapha police. However, Vilakati was quick to clarify that it was not MMM that was being investigated but it was a local scheme. The Deputy PICO said no arrests have been made yet. The founders of the pyramid scheme might be charged with money laundering.

Worth noting is that this publication reported last month that one of the local ponzi schemes which was established by a Tsabedze family at Ngogola in the Manzini region, Money Flight 2022, collapsed just after two months of its existence and was unable to pay back the investments of its members. It was said that some members of the scheme who felt robbed vowed to fight to get their money back. This is after the administrators of the seleme also stated that they

AG TURNED AWAY IN PARLY

ATTORNEY General
Majahenkhaba Dlamini was yesterday shown the exit door by
the Government Assurance
Committee (GAC) when he
attempted to stand in for Justice
and Constitutional Affairs
Minister Senator Edgar Hillary.

The AG appeared before the GAC leading a delegation of two female officers, comprising the ministry's Acting Principal Secretary Gugu Sibandze and Nothando Xaba, a crown counsel in the same ministry. Sibandze's substantive position in the ministry is that of undersecretary.

The GAC, chaired by Kwaluseni MP Bukhosi Dlamini, summoned Minister Hillary to answer on behalf of his ministry for his alleged failure to meet several resolutions of the House of Assembly. Instead of the minister heeding the summons or at least requesting a cabinet colleague to represent him, the AG appeared on his behalf accompanied by the officials and he was ready to provide the required answers to the committee. The GAC chairman MP Dlamini made his usual preamble, welcoming the delegation and allowed the 'acting minister' to proceed and respond to the committee's concerns as per the communication sent to the ministry.

The AG, a senior official in the justice ministry and top government legal advisor, indeed took up the challenge. Just when he was making his introductory remarks, it dawned on the GAC that the senior government legal advisor could not be allowed to be both a referee and a player in the game of politics.

Khubutha MP Njabulo Mabuza fired the first salvo, interrupting the 'acting minister's preamble and questioning his legality to appear before the committee as an 'acting minister'.

Informed

The AG had already informed the Committee that his responses may not be fully adequate because he was not the 'substantive minister'. MP Mabuza argued that the AG never at any point in time took the oath of office being a minister.

Mabuza also noted that even in his introductory remarks, the AG, like a typical lawyer, was leaving room for himself to escape the penalty that would be meted on him in the event it transpired the ministry failed to meet the House resolutions.

Ironically, the GAC had to seek advice on the matter from the very same AG. His advice was that protocol dictated that a minister be represented by another minister,

adding that even at cabinet he can't stand in for a minister.

The AG is an ex-officio member of both cabinet and parliament. He is also a former cabinet minister. AG Dlamini hinted that he was looking forward to the GAC Secretary Mathokoza Dlamini to advice on the matter, pleading that this was his first appearance to a GAC, implying that he did not know the rules involved.

Following the opinion given by the AG on the matter, Somntongo MP Sandile Nxumalo noted that indeed it would be inappropriate for them to allow the AG to be a player and a referee at the same time.

Under the circumstances, the chairman intervened and resolved the matter by dismissing the AG and his delegation. 'Seemingly, we are not on the right track.

We are definitely not doing the right thing," said the GAC chairman.

He said the best option was to wait for the minister of justice or his representative who would be expected to be a legally appointed minister.

Minister Hillary was away on state duties in Switzerland and according to the acting principal secretary of the day in the ministry, Gugu Sibandze, the minister was expected to return by yesterday.

Witchdoctor escapes arrest, client arrested for witchcraft

A Mbhuleni witchdoctor has evaded arrested after his client was found using muti he gave her at another man's homestead.

Information gathered is that the witchdoctor gave the woman (Ntombi Shongwe) muti and told her to perform certain rituals including feeding dogs her vomit.

Little did the witchdoctor know that it was a crime to pretend to use traditional powers for the purpose of gain.

Police will be clamping down on people who engage on such practices.

The witchdoctor escaped from being arrested as the complaint was lodged against his client by the people who caught her performing the rituals in their home.

It is said the woman who is in her early 40s consulted a witchdoctor and was given muti that would help her son win a case of house breaking and theft.

The police said they relied on the person using supernatural powers to admit to them that he or she was using muti, then he or she would be charged and arrested.

The police stated that such acts date back

centuries but it was for the public to come out and lodge complaints against false prophets and witchdoctors.

Police were said to be clamping down on people who put adverts and claimed to be using charms, supernatural powers, witchcraft, sorcery, enchantment or conjuration.

Wrath

Some false prophets have already faced the wrath of the law and others were charged with contravening section 80 of the Crimes Act.

Worth noting is, this Act is titled "pretending to use supernatural power for purposes of gain".

It states that any person who for purposes of

gain pretended to exercise or use any kind of supernatural power, witchcraft, sorcery, enchantment or conjuration or undertakes to tell fortunes or pretends from his skill or knowledge in any occult science to discover (where or in what manner anything supposed to have been stolen or lost may be found) shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to a fine of E400 or imprisonment not exceeding one year.

The Act continued to state that any person who practiced as a diviner, witchdoctor or witch finder shall be guilty of an offence and liable upon conviction to a fine of E400 or imprisonment not exceeding one year.

What you wear might get you in trouble people should be careful of what they wear.

Section 78 (2) of the Crimes Act 6 of 1889 states that any person who is found wearing any charm, dress, ornament, emblem or insignia which according to Swazi custom indicated the wearer as a diviner, witchdoctor or witch finder shall be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction a fine of E200 or imprisonment not exceeding six months.

CIRCUMCISION COSTS BOY (9) HIS MANHOOD

BLANTYRE: A Malawian family has filed a K10m lawsuit against a local hospital after their son lost his penis following a forced circumcision.

According to Malawi24, the 9-year-old victim was found lying close to his home shortly after the procedure took place in the Chikhwawa district.

The boy's father alleged that he was operated on by the SSDI, a component of the ministry of health that did male circumcisions as a means of preventing the spread of HIV. The boy was said to have been taken along with several other minors after they were coerced

by sweets, juices and biscuits.

The father complained that his son was operated on against his will and contrary to Sena cultural laws.

Previous reports indicated that circumcision did not contribute to a decrease in the rate of HIV infection, with statistics showing that HIV rates had doubled in Malawi, despite a range of interventions having been put in place.

Other studies had found that circumcised men had the highest prevalence of HIV in Malawi, Malawi24 said in a separate report.

Man tells court demons 'pushed' him to assault another

A man who appeared before Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi for assault said he was possessed by demons when he assaulted a man aged 20 years.

Sandile Mabuza pleaded guilty to assaulting Sibusiso Shongwe at PTS, in Mbabane on May 14.

A medical report was presented as evidence in court, it stated that the complainant arrived at Mbabane government hospital at about 23:00 hours with a swollen left hand.

Upon further examination, it was discovered that the complainant had a broken middle finger.

"I cannot dispute the doctor's report, I am not a doctor and the doctor knows what he is talking about," the accused said in court.

Mabuza said the complainant and a group of friends were playing on the road leading to his (Mabuza) home and they damaged one of his car's rear-view mirrors.

Ran off

The accused told the court that the friends of the complainant ran off and he managed to catch the complainant before striking his left hand with a knobkerrie.

Mabuza was found guilty and in mitigation, he told the court that he was unemployed.

"I did take the law into my own hands and I was wrong, however, I have been cooperative with the police. I brought myself to the station when requested to do so. Demons forced me to assault this man," he said.

"There is no demon, we just attach too much value on our earthly possessions. You saw the damage on your car and took it to heart. Had the complainant died from your assault what would you do," the magistrate said.

Mabuza was ordered to pay a fine of E2 000 or spend two years in a correctional facility.

A request was made by Mabuza for the court to allow him to pay his fine in monthly instalments, but this request was denied.


Community

'Cops asked for money from arrested Pakistan national'

BUSINESS friends and sympathisers of incarcerated businessman, Akber Ali, have alleged that the Pakistan national was so generous such that he would lend money to the police and further fund their parties.

Ali is the owner of Mpumalanga Wholesale and Supermarket in Siteki and has been charged together with three others for allegedly hacking one Naeem Khan Gul with bush-knives and iron rods, causing him serious bodily harm.

Ali's co-accused were Zafar Iqbal, Ehsan Ahmed and Wasim Ranjhi and were arrested last month.

The accused persons are facing a charge of attempted murder and malicious damage to property and had been remanded at the Big Bend correctional facility.

Following their prolonged stay behind bars, their sympathisers have come out to make allegations against the police, threatening to 'spill the beans' on what they termed as corrupt practices.

EMPLOYEES of Mpumalanga Wholesale and Supermarket wake up every morning to camp near the entrance of their workplace with the hope that it will re-open.

The wholesale and supermarket that had 25 workers closed business when Akber Ali was arrested last month. The workers allege that they have not been getting their salaries since the shop closed indefinitely. Speaking on behalf of the workers, Machawe Magwaza said their livelihood has

been greatly affected by the closure of the shop as they could not get their salaries, thus had no means of making a living. Magwaza said some of them had already been kicked out of their rented flats as they owed rent. He pointed out that some employees had worked at the shop for many years now, and going out to look for a new job would be difficult. Magwaza said they were praying that their employer would eventually get bail so that they would

return to work.

be identified as a business friend to Ali, said they were puzzled by the assertions by the police that por-

trayed Ali as a dangerous man in the society.

Ranjha said they were shocked to learn that Ali was labelled as a dangerous man while he has been generous to many people, including the police.

He claimed that presently, a number of police officers were still in Ali's debtor books as they used to borrow money from him.

The businessman, who spoke in vivid English, further claimed that Ali would also fund parties for some senior officers which would be hosted at either at the police camp or the police station premises.

"We do not understand how the police have now come up to say that Ali is a dangerous man when he has been so generous to them and other people of the community," said Ranjha.

Ranjha claimed that Ali had also been helpful to some elderly people of the community by giving them food.

Of note is that Ranjha's allegations were in line with what Naeem Gul Khan said about Ali being friends with the police.

Naeem made the allegations while on his hospital bed, saying Ali was untouchable as he had connections with senior police officers. Such allegations were, however, quickly brushed off as Ali and his co-accused were eventually arrested and charged for their crimes.

Men granted E5 000 bail each for dagga possession.

By Sizwe Dlamini Piggs Peak Magistrate's Court

A 33-year-old man from Buhleni appeared before Magistrate Simangele Mbatha for dagga possession.

Celumusa Mhlanga told the magistrate that when arrested at Buhleni, the dagga he weighed only 10 kilograms (KG) had not the 15kg that was cited with in court.

The magistrate told the accused that if he had any queries as regards his charge, he should ask for an amendment to the charge sheet.

Mbatha granted Mhlanga bail set at E5 000 and further advised the accused that his trial date was July 8.

He pleaded guilty to the charge of being found with the illegal herb weighing

Mthembu was also granted bail at E5 000 and was further ordered to reappear before court on May 24, for trial.

The magistrate advised both men to surrender their travel documents to the Buhleni Police and that they should not attempt to apply for new ones.



Police, public nab fraudster

DROUGHT DRIVES PREGNANT WOMEN TO HOME DELIVERY

THE country's maternal and neonatal mortality rates are likely to go up as the prevailing drought situation has forced more women to deliver their babies at home, without skilled attendance.

A number of pregnant women, especially in the rural areas are said to be shying away from clinics for antenatal care due to lack of money and means to go to the clinic. Most have said they prefer to deliver their babies at home in a bid to save the little resources they have for food.

UNFPA Assistant Representative Margaret Thwala-Tembe said this may come at a high price, as the women stand to lose their lives or of their babies, should there be complications.

"Amid the prevailing drought, it is still important that women are attended by skilled health workers when delivering their babies," Tembe said.

She was speaking during a train-

ing workshop for health workers on Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR) at Lugogo Sun on Tuesday, where she challenged health workers to be on the lookout, as the prevailing drought could reverse the achievements that have been made so far in curbing maternal mortality

It was revealed that, according to the Demographic Health Survey 2007, about 589/100 000 women die, due to maternal related complications. Tembe noted that from the drought assessment which was completed in March, it could be deduced that fewer women go for antenatal care and the number of women who deliver at home is increasing.

"The high maternal mortality rate in the country demands urgent attention, including determining the underlying causes of maternal, perinatal and neonatal deaths, whilst MDSR is one of the strate-

gies that have been recommended by the World Health Organisation (WHO) for reducing maternal deaths," she urged.

WHO has released global Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR) technical guidelines, which the country has already adapted and domesticated.

The aim is to count every maternal death, review of deaths (to determine the underlying causes)

and implement responses to scale using a phased approach.

Common contributing factors to maternal deaths include; delays in seeking health care; difficulties in getting transport to go to the health facility; as well as, inadequate skilled attendance at pregnancy, delivery and after delivery.

The ministry of health, through support from UNFPA and WHO has embarked on a training for health workers initiative on MDSR. The purpose of the training is to build capacity for conducting Maternal, Perinatal and Neonatal Death Surveillance and Response (MPNDSR) at all levels of health care. It is envisaged that this willhelp to improve the quality of maternal, perinatal (seven days post-delivery) and neonatal health

Danger

"We still have a lot to do as health workers, hence there is no time to relax. We need to educate both our men and women to look out for the danger signs during pregnancy and encourage them to deliver at a health facility.

We need to improve our infrastructure, employ more midwives and ensure that medical supplies are available in order to respond to any maternal challenge," Tembe emphasised.

Participants noted that the government of Swaziland has worked hard to overcome some of the challenges that women face, which then result in maternal deaths.

Women warned against using bomasheshisa

PREGNANT women are still using traditional concoctions known as 'bomasheshisa' for a fast delivery.

This was noted during training of health workers on Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR) at Lugogo Sun on Tuesday.

The health workers observed, that some women still uses these traditional concoctions, when they exercise home deliveries.

Women were then warned against using these concoctions as some end up delivering their babies along the

way to the hospital or get there with unusual contractions (labour).

Women are encouraged that even during this drought situation, it is still important that they deliver at a health facility so that they can be attended to, in case there are complications.

NOW is the time to take stock of real issues playing out at the **Teaching Service Commission** (TSC) because the courts have made startling observations about the extent to which unprofessional tactics could be effectively engaged to get one out of the way.

The next question is: where are the greyheads that were strategically recalled from retirement to wave the magic wand to save the teaching profession and its administration?

Mduduzi Nkambule, the executive secretary, has been exonerated by the High Court of Swaziland of charges of corruption where he had been accused of having recommended his wife for the position of school principal when he should have either blown the whistle or recused himself, but, as it turned out, this allegation was baseless.

It, therefore, gives credence to the allegations running like wildfire that the Teaching Service Commission arena is nothing but a pentagon where all sorts of schemes are plotted in order to get even with adversaries.

Bribes

For others the TSC is a source of quick cash through manipulating TSC numbers for none-xistent posts or fleecing bribes from teachers who happened to find themselves on the opposite end with their employer. Watch this space, we shall be covering all the action drama when Mduduzi returns to office.

While most professions subscribe to the school that self-regulation is the ideal way to advance the cause of the particular profession, teachers are bringing in new sets of factors such as corruption as being the main source of undoing of the principles of self-regulation.

Scholars such as Roy Baumeister assert that under regulation occurs because of deficient standards, inadequate monitoring, or inadequate strength. Mis-regulation occurs because of false assumptions or mis-

directed efforts, especially an unwarranted emphasis on emotion.

The evidence supports a strength (limited resource) model of self-regulation and suggests that people often acquiesce in losing control. Loss of control of attention, failure of transcendence and various lapse-activated causes all contribute to regulatory

In the yester year, Swaziland has been grappling with issues of the collapse of the rule of law and the country is still hung over. During this time, there were those in the legal and justice system who benefitted from the Makhulu Baas reign of terror by manipulating the registry of the courts, calling (pseudo) judges to suggest judgements and downright fabricating court rulings without matters being given due diligence.

In these instances there were cases of teachers who never saw the light of day because some officials within government systems are able to manipulate the dilapidated state of rule of law in the country. These cases have still not yet been resolved and a cry by the affected teachers is just wasted energy because it lands on deaf ears, it is a cry in the wild. In some instances, teachers have cases and appear before the TSC where

quite often they allegedly later realise that judgements had already been made before hearings.

Teachers have resisted transfers into far flung areas, away from their families, but their pleas not heard simply because their posts had already been allocated to some teachers of favour for returns of a kind. Some of the favoured teachers are given this benefit: Challenge your suspension and we shall make sure you win it!

We had thought the bringing in of experienced greyheads in the education fraternity such as Hugh Magagula and Reginah Shongwe to brand traditional authority together with extreme Swazi conservative principle would give the TSC a somewhat adult face.

Expectations

Contrary to these expectations, we have heard teachers complaining that they are made to answer to trumped up charges in order for some officials to extort money from them or rather have them removed from office in order to be replaced by relatives and friends of those who happened to hold upper hand at the commission.

We thought the old guard taken from quiet retirement would bring in the magic they acquired over the years to turn the situation around, introducing a contemporary adage in Swazi culture: an old broom sweeps clean.

These allegations were often met with strong rebuttal, especially by those to whom fingers pointed, but ironically government has failed to institute an investigations or commission into the operations of TSC much against the loud public outcry.

The courts even though they have not come out to make a strong pronouncement on the goings on at TSC, have somewhat raised very strong points that must give pointers to both parliament and the executive to consider it and take drastic step towards overhauling the entire system and replacing it with more workable and credible systems.

Teachers this last week howled helplessly at their centre in Manzini, revealing how the bottom end is a basic requirement for female teachers to have their requests for either transfers or appointments attended to by the TSC, failing which it is the cash.

Surely, this is not a fabrication coming from teachers themselves and these could be a great source of information if government is to be serious about turning the situation around at the TSC.

It is mere pep talk to suggest that teachers must volunteer information to the very vultures that are gatekeepers of same ready to devour them.

The most credible provision would be for an independent enquiry into the TSC operations with a view of understanding what the teachers are complaining about.

The teachers must be assured the necessary protection against being exposed to victimisation by their superiors; they must also be given the assurance that all the information they volunteer shall not be used against them but to correct the situation by turning around the otherwise rotten status quo. All this can be ably done by an independent audit into the institution of the TSC.

All this is possible because the minister of education is a retired teacher himself who had also risen to the ranks of heading the teachers' organisation SNAT.

This man is aware of the teachers' plight especially after he hosted them to a party during school hours at the Somhlolo National Stadium where they danced and drank the day away.

On this day alone, the teachers were able to reiterate their situation at the dysfunctional TSC but maybe he is still working on a grand plan he shall unleash on the eve of his definite exit from the position after next

Sao Paulo - A minister whose Miss Bumbum model lover posed nude in front of parliament - then did a raunchy photo shoot with him inside his cabinet office...

Prostitutes providing sexual services inside the men's bathrooms of the National Congress, and a leaked video apparently showing a leading politician fondling a woman's breasts and receiving oral

Congressmen caught engrossed in hardcore pornographic videos inside the Chamber of Deputies during a key debate on political reform.

And a senator who forgot to mute his phone when he opened a sex video during a vote to impeach the president - allowing a woman's orgasmic screams to echo through the silent chamber before the fumbling politician managed to switch it off. Welcome to Brazil's corridors of power, where it is not hard to see why South America's largest nation is descending into political farce and economic chaos.

Issues

And that's even before you get to the serious issues. In Brazil's last government, which was last week dismantled after the suspension of President Dilma Rousseff pending an impeachment trial, 19 cabinet serving ministers were under investigation for crimes including corruption, money-laundering and racketeering.

Rousseff is accused of illegally manipulating finances to hide a growing public deficit ahead of her re-election in 2014, charges she denies.

With Brazilians tired of corrupt politicians, you would have expected Interim President Michel Temer, who took office last week, to steer clear of names already tainted by accusations of wrongdoing. On the contrary, Seven of Temer's ministers - a third of his cabinet are under investigation in accused of involvement in a massive corruption scandal at state oil company Petrobras.

The so-called operation Car Wash investigation has so far uncovered a huge kickback and bribery scheme at the oil giant, with dozens of politicians accused of siphoning off at least £2.5billion of public money, much of which was allegedly used to fund election campaigns.

Other ministers have been accused or condemned for other crimes, with one - now in charge of transport - found guilty of stealing money meant for children's school meals.

Temer's chief of staff, meanwhile, was accused of inventing a 'phantom' member of cabinet in a previous government and pocketing the nonexistent employee's

Eliseu Padilha is also under investigation for concealment of assets, racketeering, bribery, embezzlement and improper conduct. Incredibly, of the 23 cabinet members in Temer's government, only six have never been investigated on charges of corruption.

Of those, one is a leader of the controversial Universal Church, considered a cult, which preaches that people are possessed by demons.

Another is the son of a Brazilian general found guilty of torture, assassination and disappearances during the military dictatorship.

Perhaps it's not that surprising though - Temer himself is accused of receiving millions in illicit payments from the Petrobras scandal. In fact, although he has taken office as president, he has been

banned from running for election

for eight years by Sao Paulo's Electional Tribunal who are tasked with stopping 'dirty' politicians from seeking votes.

And during another corruption investigation in the 1990s, the man now leading Brazil was accused of receiving 21 bribery payments from a construction company, in return for lucrative contracts, totalling \$345million.

Corruption

For Paulo Baia, professor of political sociology at Rio de Janeiro's federal university, Brazil's endemic corruption is costing the resource-rich country dearly.

He told MailOnline: 'Corruption is the one biggest threat to Brazil. It hinders growth, it halts our development. Corruption is an extra tax that we all have to pay.

'But while the people of Brazil want it to stop, the politicians who benefit from it don't. The population is finally rising up, but they are coming up against a political system where corruption has been systemic for four centuries. It will

take a long time to change."

In fact, Brazilian politics are so corrupt, as incredible as it sounds, a former clown could end up becoming president if, as the country's Order of Attorneys is insisting, all of those accused of wrongdoing are disqualified from office.

If Temer could no longer stay in office, power would be passed to the president of the Senate, Renan Calheiros - whose involvement in the Petrobras scandal is also being stigated.

The next person in line, president of the Chamber of Deputies Eduardo Cunha, has already been suspended after being accused of obstructing investigations into his alleged receipt of bribes.

Police have launched an investigation into possible prostitution in the men's bathrooms of the Chamber of Deputies, after a video that appeared to show a man in a suit with a prostitute went viral. Other call girls have claimed prostitution is common around the Brazilian parliament, with rich politicians willing to pay high fig-

ures to satisfy their sexual desires.

Only six out of 23 members of Interim President Michel Temer's new cabinet have never been investigated on charges of corruption. More scandal hit parliament when footage of a high class prostitute emerged.

The presidency, then, would have to be passed to the federal deputy who received the most votes at the last election, Celso Russomano, but he was found guilty of embezzlement in November last year.

The federal deputy with the second highest number of votes is Tiririca, a celebrity clown and comedian turned congressman is next in the long line to the presidency.

Ironically, the funny man was last year the most active lawmaker in parliament, voted one of Brazil's best politicians and one of only eight per cent of deputies who didn't miss a single session in four years.

Meanwhile, many of those holding high office who should have been concentrating on their jobs while the country slipped into crisis appear to have

been more preoccupied with other things. On the day Brazil's new tourism minister Alessandro Teixeira took office last month, faced with the challenge of restoring Brazil's image ahead of the Olympics, he was busy posing for a series of risque photos with his busty model lover, Milena Santos, inside his cabinet office.

Milena, who won Miss Bumbum USA in 2013, later posted the images on her Facebook page along with the words 'My first day as First Lady of Tourism of Brazil.'

Powerful

She added: 'It's not for nothing that, behind a great man, there is always a beautiful and powerful woman.'

It later emerged that Teixeira had been employing Milena's aunt, who raised her as her daughter, on a salary of £4 000 a month as his 'advisor'.

Milena later said in an interview: 'I'm no longer a model, I haven't taken part in beauty contests for a long time. People are associating me with my past. The political upheaval and volatile regime change means that most government departments have ground to a halt, with often devastating consequences for ordinary Brazilians affected by the impasse.

They include education, with students around the country occupying hundreds of schools to protest for better quality teaching and learning conditions, complaining of crumbling buildings and overcrowded classrooms.

Brazil's health department also faces its biggest crisis for years, with drastic cuts to frontline services while at the same time finding itself at the centre of the fight against Zika virus, which has caused 1 113 cases of braindeforming microcephaly in newborn babies in just the last six months.

And as the Olympics loom, the revolving door at Brazil's sports ministry, which has seen three different ministers in just two months, is a huge concern for organisers. Sports minister George Hilton stepped down at the end of March after leading it

Just days ago, a separate investigation launched by a Sao Paulo court requested the opening of an investigation into three former mayors suspected of 'administrative dishonesty'.

> Of the three, two are new ministers on Temer's government - foreign minister José Serra and min-

ister for Communications, Science and Techology Gilberto Kassab.

The investigation added shame to two more members of his handpicked cabinet, already criticised for comprising of only white, upper-class men.

At the same time, the new minister for Planning, senator Romero Juca is being investigated by the Supreme Federal Court accused of taking bribes from electricity companies, as well as for racketeering in the Petrobras scandal. Cabinet secretary Geddel Vieria Lima is also named in the Petrobras investigation, as well as suspected of having used his influence to benefit a construction company.

Cities Minister Bruno Araujo is also accused of receiving multimillion pound payments from another construction company Odebrect, whose CEO Marcelo Odebrecht is now serving 19

years in jail for his part in the Petrobras corruption case.

Brazil's new health minister, Ricardo Barros, meanwhile, was in 2011 caught on tapped phone conversations fixing the bidding for a public contract to the tune of

£1.5million, a case he is still fighting. As ordinary voters watch the growing political turmoil unfold, many wonder how Temer's cabinet, most of whom are embroiled in serious police investigations or fighting court proceedings, can really concentrate on sorting out the growing problems facing the country.

Perhaps what is most disappointing, though, is that in giving cabinet posts to some of his closest friends he has awarded them political immunity from prosecution and even more power, which many suspect is the real reason for their appointments.

Professor Paulo Baia believes voters will have to wait for years to see a Brazil free from the shackles of corruption.

He said: 'I can see how absurd it looks to people outside of Brazil that politicians being investigated for corruption are allowed to stay in their posts.

But it is the way things are here, until their last appeal is rejected.

There is a growing movement to stop anyone who is under investigation from holding public vesoffices but it is meeting an even stronger and determined opposiction, because there are just so many politicians who would lose their jobs if the law was passed.

I don't see how corruption can be stamped out with the current politicians we have. But the young people who are coming up, who will be the next judges and politicians, will ensure corruption will one day be brought under

THE poultry industry has only six months to adjust to the new maximum permitted levels of brine, a fluid, which is injected into chicken and other meat products to retain tenderness and flavour.

This follows the recent announcement by the South African ministry of agriculture that poultry products found not compliant with the regulations would not be allowed to be offered for sale within the republic. This new announcement would put pressure to the country's commercial poultry sector which boasts of over 12 tonnes sales volumes, worth over E200 million, with South Africa being the main export destination, while the country also imports poultry from South Africa.

Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati said the ministry would sit down and look at ways to enforce the same requirements.

"This is critical because we work together with South Africa, as my counterpart has made this announcement, we have to follow suit," he said. The minister confirmed that the brine percentage had been benchmarked by South Africa. According to the new South African regulations the total brine injection allowed for the whole carcasses was limited

to a maximum of 10 percent, up from the previously prescribed eight percent. However, the total brine allowed for individual portions of fresh and frozen poultry was capped at 15 percent, while previously there was no limit prescribed.

Happy

Vilakati said they were happy with the recent changes of the regulations, saying it was critical to ensure that consumers were getting value for their money.

Speaking to Fin24, South African Minister of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries, Spokesperson Bomikazi Molapo said the new regulation would bring about greater transparency

and fair balanced trade.

"Currently, the level of brine injected into individual quick frozen meat is not set or regulated, and that distorts the playing field in terms of trade," she said.

Quality

Molapo noted that the Agricultural Product Standards Act 119 of 1990 was concerned with the quality of the product being sold. Related to this, she said, was the issue of product integrity which involved the compositional properties of the product.

"Labelling on the packages is only important to the extent that the compositional properties and integrity of the product is not

compromised," said Molapo.

Meanwhile, Vilakati said the ministry would do everything to protect the local poultry industry due to its contribution in the balance of trade with the republic of South Africa.

"Our poultry trade relationship with South Africa is reciprocal. We export a lot of our poultry to the republic and they in turn also do the same. So we need to do everything we can to ensure that we keep this relationship intact," said Vilakati. A senior poultry officer from the ministry of agriculture said they had started consulting with the health department, with regards to enforcing the new brine requirements.

Bank liquidity up 4%

BANK liquidity reserves' are in a healthy position as they have increased by four percent in the last couple of months.

Bank liquidity is a measure of the bank's ability to readily find the cash it may need to meet demands upon it.

The Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) Money and Banking Statistics March/April reported that in February 2016 banks liquidity surplus stood at over E371 million, in March this figure jumped to E739 million.

"Bank's liquidity ratio has increased to 26.2 percent in March 2016, from 22.8 percent in February 2016," said the report.

Liquidity can come from direct cash holdings in currency or on account at the central bank. Effective July 2011, the banks were required to maintain liquid assets amounting to 20 percent of domestic liabilities to the public, whilst the Swazi Bank maintained 17 percent.

These figures have the subliminal connotation that banks had more of their assets in liquid cash as opposed to being handed out in loans. This

was reflected by the lower rate of loans, made by banks during the period under review.

"Total loans and advances made out for the month of March total E10.5 billion as opposed to February where total loans and advances recorded E 11 billion," said CBS.

Whether this situation was caused by demand side issues or supply side issues was not certain as the data did not determined this subject. With the recent increases in interest rates, demand for loans and advances have fallen as individuals and institutions shied away from loans due to these increases.

Alternatively, on the supply side banks could be more risk adverse and as a result would lend cautiously. Meanwhile, the CBS reported that

loans and advances to total deposits increased from 85.7 percent to 87.7 percent. This increase in the financial ratio meant that more of banks' deposits were going towards loans and advances; therefore this rationale implicitly pointed to demand side factors to the fall in loans and advances and subsequent increases in liquidity reserves.

Domestic liquid assets rose by 8.7 percent over the review month, having contracted by 7.4 percent in February 2016.

"The month-on-month improvement was because of growth in commercial banks' holdings of the Rand and Lilangeni as well as an increase in the balances held at the Central Bank," said the CBS.

"I would like to see the cotton produced in Swaziland to be added value, like manufacturing garments, in the country as opposed to exporting the cotton and subsequently importing the finished product which will fetch a higher price in the market," Vilakati said.

Due to the importance of cotton, the government established the cotton board through Act No.26 of

The board has, inter alia, six main functions namely; to advise the minister of agriculture on all matters concerning the cotton industry which included promoting cotton growing, ginning and processing in the country.

"As your home ministry you have our full support and we look forward to working with you for the improvement of the sector," he said.

The minister urged the board to exercise due diligence in their duties and to adhere to corporate governance practices.

"Integrity is important in such positions and I trust the board members possess this personality trait in abundance," he said.

"We will look into providing corporate governance training for the board so that they fully understand the concept of corporate governance and how it manifests in the board room," he added. The minister concluded by extending his deepest gratitude to the previous board members.

Call for snap debate on attack against Gordhan

CAPE TOWN - The Democratic Alliance yesterday called for a snap debate on what it called the political assault against Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan and the National Treasury.

DA shadow minister of finance David Maynier said in a statement that he has sent a request to Speaker of the National Assembly Baleka Mbete for a debate "of public importance on what appears to be a deliberate campaign to intimidate the Minister of Finance, Pravin Gordhan, and to undermine National Treasury".

He was hoping for a debate before the recess on May 26.

Since his reappointment in December to the post he held from 2009 to 2014, Gordhan has been facing one headwind after another amid efforts to restore investor confidence and ward off a junk credit rating.

The latest came in a report of Gordhan facing imminent arrest after the Hawks handed a docket over to the National Prosecuting Authority for his involvement in the SA Revenue Service's "rogue unit".

Minor

In response to that, Maynier said Gordhan's "arrest" would cause an economic earthquake, which would make "9/12" look like a minor economic tremor.

"9/12" refers to December 9 last year when President Jacob Zuma

unceremoniously sacked then finance minister Nhlanhla Nene, replacing him with the unknown Des van Rooyen. Van Rooyen's appointment lasted only four days before Gordhan was recalled to his old post.

Yesterday Maynier said the country is at a "tipping point" with economic growth collapsing, 8.9 million people unemployed; and the economy in danger of a ratings downgrade.

"We cannot afford what amounts to a sustained political assault on the finance minister, and the only highly professional officials at National Treasury," said Maynier.

Sun to pay Peermont R675m

JOHANNESBURG - Sun International will pay R675 million (\$42.8 million) to fellow South African hotel and casino operator Peermont Global after an attempt to buy the closely held company collapsed amid a failure to win antitrust

The owner of the Sun City resort northwest of Johannesburg had agreed to pay as much as R900 million to Peermont if the deal failed and a new complex at Menlyn Maine, in the South African capital of Pretoria, started operations. A settlement was reached as the resort is at an advanced stage of construction and will open in April. Sun International said in a statement on Wednesday. Peermont had objected to the project in the High Court before a deal was struck to combine the companies.

Sun International agreed to buy Peermont for R9.4 billion in March 2015 to add resorts such as Johannesburg's Emperor's Place and resolve the dispute over the Menlyn Maine complex. The Competition Commission recommended in December that the deal be blocked due to the affect on the gambling market in Gauteng. The Competition Tribunal was due to conduct a hearing into the takeover in June, three months after a March 31 approval deadline set by the companies, Sun International said. BLOOMBERG

R12bn to recycle mine water

JOHANNESBURG - Sulphates will be removed, making it suitable for commercial use as industrial or potable water.


The combined cost of the emergency works and long-term solution projects to clean Johannesburg's acid mine water is currently estimated at about R12 billion over the next few years, but it will come at a cost to the

Minister of Water and Sanitation Nomvula Mokonyane said Wednesday that the purpose of the long-term solution was to further treat the water by removing sulphates, making it suitable for commercial use as either industrial or potable water.

"The long-term solution will therefore turn the acid mine drainage problem into a longterm sustainable solution by producing safe water," her department said. It has taken five years and R225 million to stabilise the flow of acid water from abandoned mines in Gauteng, which had put the region's water supply under severe threat, in the first phase of protecting Johannesburg's water supply.

Now that that had been accomplished, it was time for phase two, Mokonyane said at the launch of the long-term solution to acid mine drainage (AMD) at the AMD central basin in Germiston, east of Johannesburg.

The minister said 33% of the cost for phase two would be covered by Johannesburg water users, the TimesLive website reported. The rest would be covered by mining companies. Phase two (the long-term approach) aimed to turn acid mine drainage into fully treated water, which would "substantially" in crease water supply to the Vaal River system and meet the needs of South Africa's economic hub, Mokonyane said. Girl kidnapped by Boko Haram escapes

ABUJA - Cradling her four-month-old baby lovingly in her arms, this is the first picture to emerge of both Amina Ali and her child after they were found more than two years after being abducted by Boko Haram.

The 19-year-old is seen holding the child she gave birth to in captivity after being reunited with her family at a military base in Damboa, Nigeria, following her abduction by the extremist group in 2014.

Amina was discovered yesterday in the Sambisa Forest area of Borno state by civilian vigilantes assisting the military and brought back to her home town of Mbalala, near Chibok. Her discovery raises hopes for the release of 218 others still being held by Boko Haram, following the mass abduction from a boarding school in northeastern Nigeria more than two years ago.

Her discovery may provide information as to the whereabouts of the other teenagers, although Amina told her mother and family doctor that some of the Chibok girls have died in captivity. Daily Mail

Secret EU plan to pay African regimes

BRUSSELS - EU chiefs have hatched a secret plot to work with African dictators to stop migrants reaching Europe, a leaked report has revealed.

The plan would see £35million earmarked for eight African countries including Sudan which is ruled by accused war criminal President Omar Hassan al-Bashir.

In return, they would be asked to intercept refugees heading to the Mediterranean and beyond.

But the March meeting of 28 ambassadors, led by Germany, agreed that 'under no circumstances' should the public learn of the agreement.

An aide of EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs Federica Mogherini even warned that Europe's reputation was at stake if the details emerged, it was reported.

The minutes of the meeting and other classified documents were obtained by German publication Der Spiegel and public TV station ARD.

According to the report, the £35million would be used over three years to train border police and set up detention camps, mainly in Sudan.

Other measures include installing cameras, scanners and servers for registering refugees to the Sudanese regime. Daily Mail

Egypt-Air flight believed to have crashed into the Mediterranean

CAIRO - EgyptAir flight MS804 heading from Paris to Cairo with 66 people on board is believed to have crashed in the

Mediterranean Sea after disappearing from radar.

The Airbus A320 left the French capital's Charles De Gaulle Airport at 10.09pm BST on Wednesday then went missing three hours and 40 minutes into its journey.

The plane vanished 10 miles into Egyptian airspace around 20 minutes before it was due to land.

A captain on board a merchant ship in the Mediterranean reported seeing a 'flame in the sky'.

It was supposed to touch down at 2.15am BST. There were 56 passengers, including two babies and a child and 10 crew on the flight.

The breakdown of the nationalities on board were: 30 Egyptians, 15 French, one British, one Belgian, one Iraqi, one Kuwaiti, one Saudi

Egyptian aviation officials confirmed the jet had crashed, saying the search was now underway for debris. Ihab Raslan, a spokesman for the Egyptian civil aviation authority, told SkyNews Arabia that the plane most likely crashed into the sea.

The French government says President Francois

Hollande has spoken with Egyptian president Abdel-Fattah el-Sissi by telephone and they agreed to 'closely cooperate to establish the circumstances' in which the EgyptAir flight disappeared.

The government statement cited Hollande as saying he shares the anxiety of families. French Prime Minister Manuel Valls said France is ready to join the search operation if Egyptian authorities request it. Daily Mail



The Guttmacher Institute found that the second-leading cause of death globally among women aged 15 to 19 was complications in pregnancy and childbirth.

Of the 21 million pregnancies in young women in that age group in the developing world expected this year, almost half will be unintended.

Of the 38 million adolescent women who need contraception in developing regions 60% do not use it. In Africa, the figure is almost 70%.

Akinrinola Bankole, international research director of the Guttmacher Institute, said it would cost R330 a year to meet the contraceptive needs of each adolescent female.

"This investment would bring down unintended pregnancies by 6million.

"There would be 2.1 million fewer unplanned births, about 3million fewer abortions, and more than 5,500 girls' lives would be saved, Bankole said.



Now THAT'S a 'high-way'

Chinese media has released stunning images of the Sidu River Bridge located in China's Hubei province

Situated above a 1 627-foot-deep valley, the overpass is billed as the highest suspension bridge in the world

The towering four-lane highway bridge also boasts an impressive span, which is nearly 3 000 feet long

WHILE Chinese engineers seem to have an obsession with glass-bottomed walkways, they are also experts in building high bridges very high ones.

Chinese media People's Daily Online have recently released a set of aerial pictures of the spectacular Sidu River Bridge, located in central China's Hubei Province, which is reportedly the highest completed suspension bridge in the world.

The vertigo-inducing overpass, completed in 2009, is built between two mountains over a 1 627-foot-deep valley - though some media claim it's 1 830 feet high.

The suspension bridge is situated in the remote Yesanguan Town of Badong County, Enshi Tujia and Miao Autonomous Prefecture, over Sidu

River. An aerial footage, uploaded to Youtube in January, shows the sheer size of the bridge and its incredibly scenic background. The remarkable structure, which itself is some 300 feet tall, can be seen surrounded by rocky mountains; while the alarming vertical drop underneath would make any drivers feel daunted. The location of the traffic link is in fact so remote that the closest road is reportedly two miles away. Apart from its jaw-dropping height, the towering four-lane highway bridge also boasts an impressive span, which is nearly 3 000 feet long.

Sidu River Bridge is a part of the Shanghai-Chengdu Expressway. Construction of the formidable project began in 2004 and took as long as five years to finish.

According to different sources, when the Sidu River bridge opened to the public in 2009, it overtook the 1 300foot-high Hegigio Gorge Pipeline Bridge in Papua New Guinea to be the highest bridge in the world.

The building of the bridge gathered much attention at the time as the



US B-52 bomber crashes on Guam



The bill passed the Republican-controlled House 241 to 184, largely along party lines, and sets up a confrontation with both the Republican-majority Senate and the Democratic Obama administration. The White House has threatened to veto the House bill, saying it was "woefully inadequate." *Reuters*

Chinese jets conduct 'unsafe'

BEIJING - Two Chinese fighters have conducted an "unsafe" intercept of a US spy plane in international air space over the South China Sea, the Pentagon said, as tensions mount in the strategically vital waters. Tensions between China and the United States are high in the disputed waterway, an important shipping route thought to be home to vast energy deposits, and which Beijing claims almost in its entirety." AFP

Trump links Bill Clinton to rape

NEW YORK - Donald Trump sat down with Sean Hannity last night on Fox News and hit Bill Clinton with the hardest charge yet.

Trump brought up a rape accusation against the former
Democratic president when talking about Clinton's past behavior with women with the Fox News host.

The two were discussing a recent New York Times article that was supposed to expose Trump's own treatment of women and how several of the sources had come out and said the newspaper twisted their words.

Trump labeled the story a 'con job' and called it a 'disaster' for the newspaper.

Hannity then asked why the Times hadn't dug into Bill Clinton's past.

'Are they going to interview Juanita Broaddrick? Are they going to interview Paula Jones?

Are they going to interview Kathleen Willey?' Hannity asked, ticking off the names of women who have accused Bill Clinton of inappropriate behavior through the years.

'In one case, it's about exposure. In another case, it's about groping and fondling and touching against a woman's will,' Hannity continued.

'And rape,' Trump inserted. 'And rape,' the television host repeated. 'And big settlements, massive settlements. And lots of other things. And impeachment for lying,' Trump continued.

This is only the latest in a string of attacks on Bill Clinton, after Trump himself was hammered by a pro-Hillary Clinton PAC on some of the language he's used to describe women.

During last night's interview, Trump took issue with the ad using a line out of context, in which he tells someone to go 'f*** themselves,' a comment he made about bad trade deals at a Portsmouth, New Hampshire rally in February, where he mouthed the four-letter swear word.

'The main punchline wasn't about women,' Trump pointed out. 'They put it in like it was about women. Now I guess they have to do a retraction.'

The other lines used in the attack ad, including one aimed at Fox News host Megyn Kelly, were about women.

But in order to negate these attacks, Trump has pushed back hard.

He started laying the groundwork to exploit Bill Clinton's sexual past before the first votes were being cast.

'She's got one of the great women abusers of all time sitting in her house, waiting for her to come home for dinner,' Trump said back in January.

Outbreak of nuclear war 'entirely plausible'

KIEV - The outbreak of nuclear war within a year between the West and Putin is 'entirely plausible' a former NATO chief has claimed - while promoting his novel about a 2017 war with Russia.

General Sir Richard Shirreff, who served as Nato's deputy supreme allied commander in Europe until 2014, warned that an attack on Baltic states Lativa, Estonia and Lithuania was a possibility.

He said the West should act now and boost its defences to avoid a 'potential catastrophe'.

General Shirreff has written a fictional book, 2017: War with Russia, in which nuclear war breaks out with Russia over the Baltic nations next year.

But he told BBC Radio 4's yesterday programme the scenario was 'entirely plausible'. He said: 'The chilling fact is that because Russia hardwires nuclear thinking and capability to every aspect of their defence capability, this would be nuclear war.'

Canada's 'golden boy' Prime Minister forced to apologise

TORONTO - Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau has apologized 'unreservedly' for elbowing a female opposition member of Parliament in the chest as he waded through a group of her colleagues.

Ruth Ellen Brosseau said the fracas forced her to miss a vote in the House of Commons on Wednesday as she had to leave the chamber. 'I was elbowed in the chest by the prime minister and then I had to leave. It was very overwhelming,' she said. 'I missed

the vote because of this.'
Opposition leaders have slammed the incident as 'violent' - branding Trudeau, an avid boxer, 'un-statesmanlike'. Reports claim Trudeau shouted 'get the f*** out the way' during the dispute. The kerfuffle spells a possible blow to Trudeau's image as a modern, feminist leader. It comes just days after the leader's wife was criticized for requesting help, as she said she could not juggle the job of being First Lady and being a mother-of-three. *Daily Mail*

Russian 'black widow' spy executed by ISIS

MOSCOW - The female Russian spy executed by ISIS after spending four years working undercover within the terror group, had four Islamist husbands who all died in mysterious circumstances.

Elvira Karaeva, 28, reportedly infiltrated an ISIS enclave in Russia's Caucasus region and spent years leaking information, which led to the assassinations of at least seven fighters.

ISIS has now branded the late

Ms Karaeva a 'black widow', accusing her of marrying Islamist extremists with the intention of eventually murdering them.

Her first husband Aslanbek Saraliyev - who she wed in the Chechen Republic as a 19-yearold - died during a walk in the woods with her.

Her second, Adam Shakhbiev, was leading radical who was assassinated in a taxi along with his brothers.







does not see any problem with pants. "We need to first distinguish between Christianity and culture. The notion of not endorsing pants is culturally-based. In Christianity, women can wear pants but in our Swazi cul-

ture, no," Bonginkosi Dludlu, a gospel

artist, said. On the other hand, Mayibongwe Mthimkhulu said it is about understanding the audience while adding that it was evident that in the country some people still do not accept

women who wear pants and make-up hence one needs to be always alert when interacting with these kind of

code, Hlophe laughed off the rain of fire poured her direc-She even wondered why

her dress code was questioned.

When pressed further, the artists declined to comment about the issue, while referring all questions to her management company, Leserato Events.

"No comment," said Sijabulile Vilakati, (Manager at

Leserato Events). Mandla "Cheeks" Nxumalo also declined to have his say, pointing at Vilakati as the right

person to address the matter. One of the fans, who openly disapproved the pants worn by Hlophe

(claimed the Bible was against such behaviour), did not show signs of backing down, after being attacked by those who said there was nothing wrong with the gospel artist's dress code.

I am not judging her. It is all contained within the Bible. All of you want to comfort her with a lie, knowing exactly that it is wrong? Tell her the truth, and then support her like I will do," the fan explained.


SOCCER - THEY were 32 and now they are eight.


