

WYERS SETTING CJ AGAINST KING

WE felt duty bound to put to bed a petty argument that has spiraled out of control this newspaper has had with highly respected people in society-lawyers.

Our quarrel stems from a call the Law Society of Swaziland made to its members to reject appointments into the Supreme Court bench on acting

By doing this the lawyers are pushing for the appointment of a permanent bench, a stance which we fully support as a newspaper.

However, we started seeing things differently when we highlighted (in our Tuesday edition) that rejecting the appointments into the Supreme Court bench (adhoc or permanent) was tantamount to snubbing royal appointments because such appointments are (and have been) done by His Majesty King Mswati III.

As our records would show, the King appointed acting judges into the Supreme Court bench (mostly) lawyers) last year and the latest appointments were done this year (in May to be specific).

Both the Swazi Observer and the Times of Swaziland carried loud stories on the King appointing acting Supreme Court judges.

On our end, the story was written by Simon Shabangu and it was never challenged.

Strangely, in the Times of Swaziland, the story was written by the very same journalist who on Tuesday painstakingly agreed to be the law society's clerical officer and contradict what he wrote on May 3, 2016.

Instead, he together with lawyers screamed murder by us publishing that the King appoints acting judges of the Supreme Court.

He wrote the same thing five months ago.

Short memory, we suppose. To help reboot his memory, the Times reporter, in his May 4, 2016 story quoted the Chief Justice, yes, the one he and the lawyers now say appoints acting judges saying the Supreme Court judicial officers were appointed by the King not himself.

The Times Reporter wrote: "In his speech, the CJ thanked His Majesty King Mswati III for the appointment of the acting judges. CJ Maphalala said the appointments were not made by him as the CJ but by the King."

Now we ask, what has changed in five months? What is it that the law

SEVEN TOP LAWYERS APPOINTED ACTING SUPREME COURT JUDGES

MBABANE - The appointment of seven senior lawyers as acting judges of the Supreme Court was left until the last minute as they were not only swom-in yesterday but they immediately

assumed their duties. None of the new appointees are current permanent judges of the High Court, save for permanent Supreme Court Judges in Chief Justice (CJ) Bheki Maphalala, Phesheya Dlamini and Benjamin Odoki. There was speculation surrounding the new appointees and who they would be. The newlyappointed acting judges include Law Lecturer at the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) Maxine Langwenya and Legal Advisor in the Ministry of Tinkhundla Administration and Development John Sipho Magagula. Others are Knox Mshumayeli Nxumalo, Mabandla Manzini, Zonke Magagula, Cyril Maphanga and Robert John

The appointment of the seven senior lawyers brings the total number of the judges, who will form the Supreme Court, to 10. Manzini and Cloete are not new in the positions as they were once appointed acting judges of the Supreme

The acting judges yesterday took oaths of execution and that of allegiance. In

his speech, the CJ thanked His Majesty King Mswati III for the appointment of the acting judges.

CJ Maphalala said the appointments were not made by him as the CJ but by the King. He further mentioned that the newly-appointed acting judges were expected to preside over 76 appeals, which had been filed.

He described this as historic as previously, the Supreme Court used to hear and determined 30-40 cases.

The CJ said the number of appeals had significantly risen, which was an indication that a permanent Supreme Court was now required.

He said they trusted that soon they would have the appointment of permanent Supreme Court judges as negotiations were still ongoing.

According to the CJ, this would avail an opportunity for senior judges of the High Court to ascend and become permanent judges of the Supreme Court. He said this would not only avail an opportunity for senior judges of the High Court but also for senior lawyers.

"The session will last for almost two months beginning from May 3, 2016 (yesterday) to June 30, 2016. The extended period of the session has been necessitated by the large number of appeals and as a result, the judges would require sufficient time to research, discuss and write reasoned judgments," said the CJ.

The morale of the story on lawyers rejecting royal appointments was to highlight to our learned friends one thing; The danger of dragging the King into their judiciary mess. We understand the legal and noble fight they are in by boycotting the Supreme Court but to involve the appointing authority in their fracas is wrong. This we highlighted because it has never been challenged anywhere that the King appoints acting Supreme Court judges an act that has inevitable greased pockets of many a lawyer in the process. Well some are still owed we hear.

ELECTRICITY CRISIS LOOMS AS SEC BUYS 100% FROM ESKOM

THE Swaziland Electricity Company (SEC) has reached crisis levels when it comes to power generation.

It does not look bright at all for the country. We are on a brink of a thorough load shedding or worse still- a lights off situation if the country does not receive enough rains by May next year.

As from October 1, 2016, SEC started sourcing 100% of the country's electricity from Eskom in South Africa. In simpler terms the company, for the past 20 days, has been spending money it never budgeted for

All power generation plants have been switched off because the dams used for such are depleted or at a very lower percentage capacity to generate power for the country.

A very concerned SEC Acting Managing Director Meshack Kunene said drought impacted greatly regarding power generation, lamenting that there is no clear plan B.

"There is direct correlation between the current persistent drought and power generation to the crisis. Swaziland is currently importing 100% electricity from South Africa and a local Independent Power Producer (IPP)," said Kunene who has been acting for over six months as MD.

Kunene revealed that their four hydro power stations do not have enough water to draw from hence the need to source 100 percent electricity from neighbouring states.

He said the water levels have decreased drastically hence they can no longer draw from them. The four hydro power stations are Edwaleni, Ezulwini, Maguduza and New Maguga.

Running

"Maguga has not been running for 10 months now, we last drew water from there on the first week of February. The pressure was not enough for generating electricity and trying to do that was going to damage our machinery. Luphohlo Dam has not been running since October 1," he said.

The clued up Kunene further said the flow rates in their dams have been dwindling over the years.

He said SEC has not received good rains for power generation for a period of three years now and their dam water storages have run dry. He revealed that Maguga Dam's capacity is currently at 16% while Luphohlo Dam is currently at 40%.

He revealed that SEC used to generate electricity from Maguga Dam when the dam's capacity stood at 40% and above.

He further revealed that Luphohlo Dam was recently at 36% but picked up to 40%.

...SEC to generate thermal power at Lubhuku

SEC Acting Managing Director Meshack Kunene also revealed that the company will soon generate thermal power in Lubhuku.

Kunene said the prospecting process has already been completed.

He said it was discovered that Lubhuku has about 800 hectares of coal.

"The coal is from about 40 metres below the ground to a further 160 metres. The mine has been confirmed to be mineable on open cast and deeper. That is reason enough for the country to build a thermal power station. There is about 23 million metric tons of coal and further 46 million

metric tons of coal that has been discovered," he said.

Kunene said the presence of over 60 million metric tons is good enough reason to establish a power station which could last for 40 to 50 years.

"The coal is available, this has been confirmed," he emphasised.

Kunene further revealed that SEC is currently dredging at Mkhikhomo Dam in Matsapha.

He said the dam has too much waste and they have taken advantage of the situation (drought) to clean up the dam since there are no serious rains.

"We have a contractor on site and there is very good progress on the de-silting exercise," he said.

SEC LOOKING AT OTHER POWER GENERATING OPTIONS

ACTING Managing Director Meshack Kunene said SEC is looking at other options to source electricity.

Kunene further revealed that the company is also looking at other power generation options through Independent Power Producers (IPPs).

He said currently they are receiving help from ILLOVO that generates its own electricity.

He said the company gives them

months for generation power, between October and March. He said this was the period which they used to harvest water and store the water for electricity generation.

"Every year between June and August the cost of importing elecsurplus electricity. He however lamented that most of the agreements they seal with the IPPs rarely take off.

"We are expecting to receive 880 kilowatts from an IPP that is to be established at lower Maguduza. Negotiations on building a power plant have already been completed, what is left is the financials. Two machines that will produce 12 mega-watts will be delivered in 2018," he said.

Electricity tariffs hike inevitable

MESHACK Kunene said a hike in electricity tariffs is inevitable though that will be decided by the Swaziland Electricity Regulatory Agency.

Kunene was responding to a question on the possibility of tariffs hike since the country is now importing electricity from neighbouring states.

Kunene said the regulator will look into the matter at hand, considering the fact that importing electricity from neighbouring "Currently, we are spending more money than we actually have on importing electricity,"

Kunene said.
Injection

Questioned on the E80 million government injection that was promised, Kunene revealed that SEC only got a portion of the money and they are still expecting the balance.

He did not state the amount of the balance.

SWSC TO USE LUPHOHLO FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY

ACTING SEC MD Meshack Kunene has come out to clarify that Swaziland Water Service Corporation (SWSC) is not taking over Luphohlo Dam but will only use it for emergency water supply to Mbabane residents.

Kunene said there have been concerns from the general public about SWSC using Luphohlo Dam for drawing water. Kunene said Luphohlo was solely built for power generation, but as SEC they intervened and helped out in the water crisis situation that SWSC is currently facing.

"SWSC has not started pump-

ing water from the dam yet. They are still setting up their machin-

The agreement is that they will pump water from the dam only on emergencies. They can only draw an agreed volume for a certain period.

We have an agreement with them and they can only draw 10.5 cubic megawatts which is 10 000 litres per second. We will regulate them through a metre which will measure how much they have used up. Once Hawane Dam picks up SWSC will stop drawing water from Luphohlo Dam," he explained.

Diesel engines will be the last resort - MD

ACTING Managing Director Meshack Kunene said if push comes to shove, SEC will use diesel engines to generate electricity.

Kunene said it would however be a very expensive exercise to generate water using dieseless engines.

Cost

"The cost of running those would run SEC down in a few weeks.

"Swaziland must look into power generation methods not just thermal and hydro generation," he said.

SEC's Doctor Hlongwane said through engagements with KOBWA, they have learnt that Maguga Dam might be back to normalcy by 2019 for power generation.

Drought

"The impact of the drought will affect SEC for the next years to come.

"Our saving grace would be enough continuous rains not just the drizzle that we are currently experiencing," he said.

HOSPITALS TO SHUT DOWN IN 7 DAYS IF...

THE Swaziland Nurses
Association has vowed to shut
down all government health care
facilities in the country in seven
days if government does not act
on demands that have been put
forward in a petition they delivered at the prime minister's
office yesterday.

Yesterday, the capital city was painted red when about 200 members of the Swaziland Nurses Association filled the streets and marched to the ministry of health and the prime minister's offices to deliver petitions seeking better working conditions.

While delivering the petition at the prime minister's office,

Swaziland Nurses Association President Bheki Mamba said if government does not respond to them on the demands they have put forward as an association they will shut down hospitals and clinics.

"We believe that since we have

now addressed the issue with the head of government our concerns will be addressed accordingly," he said.

Key among the issues is the continued nursing staff shortage which they claim threatens the effective



delivery of services across all the tiers of the health care services delivery system.

Recommendation

"On shortage of nurses, the government of Swaziland must improve the number of skilled nurses from the 1:1000 ratio to at least 5:1000 as per the recommendation of the World Health Organisation. Government must immediately create posts for nurses to curb the shortage in the medium run. It should also reduce the vacancy rate of the established posts to zero by employing all nurses who have just qualified as we are of the view that there are no supplies constrains in nursing in

the country. Government must also stop employing nurses on the wrong scale," reads the petition.

The petition further demands that nursing assistants must be allowed to further their studies without them having to resign.

"There must be an improved quota for nurses who are allowed to train utilising in-service, not the three per year we have seen which, is an insult to the profession.

Nothing for nurses without nurses; no profession can be able to decide how many nurses need training than the nursing profession itself. We are giving government a chance to act on these demands," states the petition.

DPM's office employee arrested for stealing E50 000 of elderly grants

A period of about six months saw a systems administrator at the Deputy Prime Minister's office defrauding government a sum of E49 929.

Sibusiso Kunene was employed under the social welfare department entrusted with the responsibility of, amongst other things, processing elderly grants when he allegedly assumed the status of being a conman.

It is alleged he did unlawfully and intentionally misrepresented to Standard Bank more than once that he was entitled to receive elderly grants as a beneficiary. His means of misrepresentation induced the government of Swaziland to its actual loss and prejudice to the sum of E49 929 which was deposited into his account at Standard Bank. Kunene allegedly committed these offences 10 times spanning over six months, thus he is facing 10 counts of fraud.

His first offence was committed in October 14, 2011 at or near Mbabane whereby he deposited E3 600 into his account while he committed his last offence in March 19, 2012. The remaining eight offences were committed in-be-tween this period whereby he would deposit varying sums of money into his own account.

While making his appearance at the Mbabane Magistrate's court, Kunene was granted bail of E24 000 by Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi.

It is alleged Kunene was suspended at work for quite a long time after it was discovered that he was playing an unlawful game with the funds belonging to the government. However, the 31-year-old man was arrested by the police recently after internal investigations and hearings were completed. Moreover, the largest amount Kunene deposited into his account came on February 17, 2012, where it is said he committed the crime of fraud by depositing a sum of E11 229 while at or near Mbabane.

Final submissions in E50m trial

THE E50 million Capacity Building Fund trial is nearing completion now as lawyers have started making submissions before High court Judge Nkululeko Hlophe.

Principal Crown Counsel Macebo Nxumalo yesterday made his submissions persuading the court to convict the accused on the grounds that the state has proved that they did commit fraud

He said businessmen Qhawe Mamba and Sabelo Mavuso, of Channel S TV and Phumelele school, respectively, had established a company, Swazi Enterprises in order to defraud government.

He said government was defrauded a lot of money which was paid to the company yet the company had not been fully registered at the time it applied to render services during the capacity building project where job creations workshops were conducted.

However, the judge had many questions to the crown on the charge of fraud preferred against them.

He questioned how the crown decided to charge them with fraud. He asked how the state suffered

prejudice or potential prejudice and misrepresentation by the acts of the company.

He said for fraud to be said to have occurred prejudice or potential prejudice and misrepresentation must be proven to have occurred together.

He questioned the crown how government suffered prejudice when the company was paid for services that were rendered.

Breached

Nxumalo submitted that the accused had breached government policy when they registered the company.

The judge wanted to know if the alleged breach of policy amounted to fraud or not, to which Nxumalo responded to the affirmative.

Nxumalo also submitted that Thembani Simelane and Phindile Gwebu had been employed as accountants in government in the ministry of finance but made payments to service providers when they knew that it was not allowed to make payments for another ministry when working for another.

He said the two were veteran accountants who were clearly aware of government procedures.

The judge asked what happened if the other ministry, in this case the then ministry of enterprise and employment, cooperated when the payments were made from the ministry of finance side.

"There was no gun put in the heads of the accountants of the ministry of enterprise to sign or authorise payments. Was there no arrangement made?" the judge asked.

Nxumalo submitted that there was no arrangement and this was proven by evidence led before court. The judge said by conduct, the ministry of enterprise officials had agreed of the arrangement. He said the two caused about E3.2 million loss to government.

"We know the effect of consent," the judge said.

Nxumalo said the two had been working with the late principal secretary in the ministry of Finance Musa Fakudze who was the main suspect in the case.

The judge wondered if more people should have been arrested including the officials in the then ministry of enterprise who were authorising the payments or not.

Nxumalo said they were supposed to have been charged as well and made accomplices, but evidence proved that they should not be charged.

The case continues.

GOVT CONCEALS E154 MILLION OVERDRAFT

THE ministry of finance has been accused of failing to disclose domestic debt of E154 million from financial statements.

This is contained in a Public Accounts Committee (PAC) report, which was tabled before Parliament on Monday by Chairperson Thulisile Dladla

The report contained the finding of the auditor general (AG) on how the public funds had been used. The auditor general, at the time, was Phestecia Nxumalo.

The auditor general found the domestic debt was excluded from 93 the financial statements. "For instance, an overdraft of E154 million has not been corrected and it was classified as an asset," part of the report states.

The auditor general went on to state there was a discrepancy between the domestic debts amount that was reported by the director of debt and the one reported in the statement of liabilities.

Ministry of Finance Controlling Officer Bheki Bhembe is reported to have acknowledged the E154 million was a discrepancy, which resulted from a reconciliation error.

Bhembe promised the accounted general the error would be addressed during the current 2016/2017 financial year.

Nxumalo recommended such anomalies should be avoided in such

"The controlling officer is urged to appreciate the auditor general's concerns in order to avoid such anomalies in future.

He is urged to quarterly update the PAC chairperson and the auditor general on addressing the issues raised," reads part of the report.

It went on to warn the controlling officer he would be charged with contempt of Parliament, should he fail to do that.

The auditor general also found government had excluded domestic debt generated investments. She reported that funds that were invested were financial assets of the government and had to always be reported on in the financial statements.

She states this was in relation to

the best practices to recognition, classification, criteria and accounting for financial instruments (assets and liabilities) which required that they should be clearly accounted for and reflected in the financial statements and the best practices should be adhered to.

The controlling officer concurred with the auditor general's findings and concurred with her recommendations. He disclosed the ministry was aligning its reporting and accounting systems to all transactions, separately, in line with the new chart of accounts.

This was also in accordance with the international standard set by the Government Finance Statistics Manual of 2001.

The auditor general, in response to what Bhembe said, noted the ministry of finance could not know how much government had in investments and returns, in the absence of records. She recommended it was paramount that investments should be reflected in the public debt account and be constantly moni-

The controlling officer, Nxumalo said, should be apprised on a regular basis by the investment committee and maintain proper records.

The controlling officer was also told to give the revised debt policy to Dladla and the auditor general within 90 calendar days after the adoption of the report. Failure to do so would result in Bhembe being charged with contempt of Parliament.

E44 million hedge funds not disclose

THE ministry of finance was found to have failed to disclose hedge funds amounting to E44.38 million.

This is contained in a Public Accounts Committee (PAC) report, which was tabled before Parliament on Monday by Chairperson Thulisile Dladla.

The report contained the findings of the auditor general (AG) on how the public funds had been used. The auditor general, at the time, was Phestecia Nxumalo.

The report states the auditor general expressed concern about the concealment of the hedge fund, JP Morgan, which was not reflected in the government

accounting records.

Ministry of Finance Controlling Officer Bheki Bhembe is reported to have submitted there were terms of the contract between government and JP Morgan that had to be followed. He said the latter, as a third party, facilitated the acquisition of the foreign exchange payments.

As per the payment schedules in the contract, government is said to have remitted E44.38 million to JP Morgan on a quarterly

basis.

Bhembe, according to the report, promised to avail the rela vant information to the office of the auditor general during the course of the current 2016/2015 financial year.

The auditor general advised controlling officer to ensure the debt was captured in the ministry's statements of accounts he failed to do so, he would be charged with contempt of

Parliament.

He was advised to give a copy of the contract between government and JP Morganto the PAC chairperson and the auditor general. He was given seven day after the adoption of this report, to do so.

The copy of the contract, the con-

trolling officer was told, should be accompanied by a report on the number of loans that were facilitated by JP Morgan and the amounts thereof. Failure to do so by the controlling officer would result in him being charged with contempt of Parliament.

The controlling officer was also tasked with undertaking a comprehensive analysis of the cost/benefit to government ansing from the engagement of a middleman (JP Morgan) as opposed to dealing directly with foreign exchange lenders.

PENSIONERS want to take new Public Service Minister Owen Nxumalo to court over the issue of the delayed conversion of the **Public Service Pension** Fund (PSPF).

The PSPF is a fund that keeps contributions from public servants for use during

The pensioners want the fund to stop being wholly owned by government and be an independent company. Members of Parliament (MPs) are still waiting for the minister for public service to sign a letter that would convert the fund to be an independent one.

The MPs ordered the minister to do so after it was discovered the fund was made an entity that is wholly owned by government.

Issue

This is now a task that is faced by Nxumalo, who was sworn in as a public service minister last week Monday.

The pensioners yesterday promised to fight this issue until they got what they wanted. They said this during their meeting at Mater Dorolosa (MDS) Church Hall.

They pointed out they were in the process of acquiring legal services to make sure something like this happened.

The members of the association were told to fork out E100 to make this a reality. They also do not want to be given 25 percent as a gratuity. They say they want 50 percent to be given to them once they have retired.

Chairperson of the Mbabane branch of the pensioners Osvart Sukati made it clear they wanted nothing to do with government on the funds.

He said the government was greedy because it saw that the fund was growing financially and it wanted a share of the pension money.

Bible

"We come from a situation whereby E600 million was given to Swaziland National Housing Board. About E567 million was also given to Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) to build its headquarters in Ezulwini.

All this was done without consulting us as owners of the funds," Sukati said.

Sukati urged all the pensioners to speak out and make their voices heard so that even the people who were not able to speak would be represented.

He articulated this by quoting the bible book of Proverbs 31:8 and 9. Verse 8, in the American Standard version of the bible, says, "Open thy mouth for the dumb, In the cause of all such as are left desolate." Verse 9, of the same version, says, "Open thy mouth, judge righteously, And minister justice to the poor and needy.'

The chairperson also told them that James 4:17 said a person who could not express his opinion was committing a sin. The American Standard version of the verse said, "To him therefore that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not, to him it is sin."

Sukati's words were shared by his deputy chairperson Elliot Mkhatshwa.

He said it was not proper for a stranger to manage his money because he had worked hard for it for so many years. He said Swazis were cowards in such a way that they would allow any person to tell them how they should use their money. He said such was not good.

Parliament, according to Mkhatshwa, was not doing justice to the people. "It is not good for a whole legislature to square up against a minister who does not want to listen to

They should do something about it. Another thing, the people who manage our pension give us the 25 percent because they want us to quickly die because they want to have the rest of the money to themselves," Mkhatshwa said.

President of the pensioners, Patrick Bhembe also concurred with the pensioners, saying they made submissions even when the report was still made by the MPs.

Man guilty of killing nephew over cattle

A man has been convicted to murder for killing his nephew in a dispute over cattle.

Elliot Mamba was found guilty of killing Sidwell Methula on January 8, 2009. The deceased had been under the care of Mamba since infancy and his school fees were paid for by him.

However, at the time the incident happened, Methula had moved out of Mamba's homestead to stay at Bothman's place in the neighbourhood.

Mamba's cattle, the court was told used to graze at the yard in Bothman's homestead, but on the day Methula demanded they should be moved.

It was stated Methula had taken alcoholic beverages when he shouted at his uncle and hurled insults at him calling for removal of the cattle from the yard.

Methula, the court was told during trial, approached Mamba in a bid to attack him armed with a knobker-

a tussle and Methula was chased by Mamba and later stabbed more than twice on the body.

The crown had led evidence that indeed Methula hurled insults at Mamba, but when the latter then attacked Methula at a later stage and he was not armed with a knobkerrie.

In his case, Mamba said Methula had attacked him armed with a knobkerrie. He told the court Methula hit

had him several times before he managed to disarm him and stabbed him in self defence.

High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudzee said even if he were to agree with Mamba that Methula had been armed and was the aggressor, the evidence he had disarmed him when he stabbed him proved that his actions were excessive. "it is trite law in murder cases that the crown must prove beyond reasonable doubt to the commission of the offence by the perpetrator.

In order to prove guilt of an accused person, the crown must establish the perpetrator committed the unlawful act that led to the necessary intention to kill known as dolus. It is this court's view the crown has succeeded in this regard in respect of the case at hand," Fakudze said.

He said it was not in dispute the two stab wounds resulted in the death of Methula.

He said the crown proved self defence could not hold as means used in averting the harm was excessive. He convicted Mamba to murder.

Disrespectful boy convicted of old man's murder

HIGH Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze has noted, with concern, the rate at which young people disrespect adults, when he convicted a boy for killing an old man.

The bone of contention was that the boy, Sikelela Khumalo, refused to give way to Joseph Ndlela when they met along a pathway. The incident happened at Emfabeni community in the Shiselweni region on June 19, 2010. Khumalo stabbed Ndlela several times on the body in a dispute over who was to give way to the other in a pathway.

The small pathway passed near a river where about five ladies were washing their laundry and fetching water when the incident happened.

According to their evidence, Ndlela approached from one direction visibly drunk and carrying a stone while Khumalo was also moving to the opposite direction and they were to meet. Ndlela demanded Khumalo to give way because he was older than him, but the latter refused, which resulted in Ndlela throwing the stone at him, but missed. The two manhandled

each other and Khumalo fell on the ground, but was lifted up by the old man by his pants, but fell because Ndlela did not have much strength due to drunkenness. There was a tussle on the ground and Khumalo drew a knife to stab Ndlela on the body several times.

He died on the scene. "The case at hand is a picture of how the youth fail to show respect to elder people. There was no reason for the deceased to ask the accused to give way. He should have allowed the old man to pass as the pathway was in an open veld.

Arrogance caused the accused to fight the deceased who was visibly drunk, according to the crown with nesses," Judge Fakudze said.

The office of the director of public prosecution was represented by Senior Crown Counsel Neamisile Masuku in the matter while lawyer Sifiso Jele from Mabila Attorneys appeared on behalf of

Khumalo as pro deo counsel. Pro deo counsel is an attorney hired by the state on behalf of suspects charged with serious crimes, but cannot afford to instruct their own legal practitioners.

In his defence Khumalo submitted he was drunk on the day in question and the knife

he was carrying belonged to a friend and he was to deliver it to him.

He told the court when he met Ndlela along the pathway he moved to another one, but the visibly drunk Ndlela continued to demand he should move and stoned him. He said he tripped and fell and Ndlela lifted him by his pants and hit him. He said Ndlela also strangled him and they fought. He said after that he did not recall what happened because he 'blacked out.'

The judge said in the confession statement submitted as evidence, Khumalo had stated after the tussle he stabbed Ndlela a couple of times. He also confessed he then ran away and went to hide in a forest because he was scared.

In his defence before court he said he acted in self defence, was provoked and was intoxicated. The crown stated the stabbing of Ndlela was not directly proportional to the provocation.

"I agree with the crown's submissions the accused's (Khumalo) reaction exceeded the reasonable grounds of provocation. The defence of private defence or self defence does not hold. The courts view is the defence of intoxication does not hold water," he said.

SIBAYA SHOULD BE ANNUAL - IDEAL

THE People's Parliament (Sibaya) should be held on an annual basis to conform to the requirements of the national constitution.

This is the view held by the Institute for Democracy and Leadership (IDEAL), which is contained in the report of a meeting at Caritas in Manzini on September 24, 2016. IDEAL is an organisation that was established by Human Rights Lawyer Thulani Maseko to ensure that the constitution was followed in the country.

The organisation convened the meeting last month to see if the constitution was still followed in the country. It was on that basis that the participants in that meeting called for the implementation of Section 232 of the Constitution.

This is the section that talks about the People's Parliament (Sibaya). Subsection (1) reads, "The people

through Sibaya constitute the highest policy and advisory council (Libandla) of the nation." The following subsection states, "The Sibaya is the Swazi National Council constituted by Bantfwabenkhosi, the *tikhulu* of the realm and all adult citizens gathered at the official residence of the

Ndlovukazi under the chairmanship of Ngwenyama who may delegate this function to any official."

Subsection (3) says: "Sibaya functions as the annual general meeting of the nation but may be convened at anytime to present the views of the nation on pressing and controversial national issues."

Maseko, when speaking to this newspaper, did confirm that the issue of Sibaya, among other issue, was discussed at length.

"We are going to convene another meeting this coming Saturday at Caritas in Manzini. We are going to make a follow-up to the resolutions we took during that meeting," Maseko said.

Suspended Heavy Plant accountant runs to court

AN accountant at Heavy Plant Centre has been suspended from work after she allegedly failed to collect debts from the company's clients.

Nonhlanhla Mathonsi has claimed that the company further withheld her salary and told her that she would only be paid after two of their major clients had paid.

She has instituted legal proceedings before the Industrial Court seeking an order directing Heavy Plant Centre to pay her salary and declare the suspension without pay unlawful and set aside.

Forklifts

She claimed that she had been employed since July 2013 by the company that rents out and sells forklifts among others items and services earthmoving equipment.

She claimed that in September 2016, all other employees were paid their salaries but she was not paid. She claimed that she approached

the managing director Zwelithini Zulu. She claimed that Zulu told her that she would not be paid until two companies who owed money for services rendered had paid. She claimed that Zulu told her to demand payment from the two companies.

The companies would not be named because they are not party to the proceedings and have no interest in the matter.

Suspended

She claimed that she was then told that she was being suspended from work and she approached her attorney Bonginkosi Xaba who wrote a letter of demand to her employer.

She claimed that after receipt of the letter of demand Zulu sent her a message via social networking site WhatsApp and told her to fetch a suspension letter.

She submitted that she suspension of her salary was unlawful in that she had never signed a contract to the effect that once a customer failed to pay for services rendered she would not be paid.

"I further wish to say that as an accountant I did request for payment

but the customers could not pay by the end of September 2016.

"I further wish to state that the withholding of my salary is discriminatory in nature because all other employees received their salaries at the end of September 2016, except for me," she said.

She claimed that the employer never at any stage discuss issues of misconduct with her, therefore it was unlawful to suspend her without pay

In its responding papers, the company alleged that Zulu had been reminding Mathonsi to do her job diligently in the past four months.

Affidavit
Zulu, in his affidavit, claimed that she had not been doing her job properly, which entailed keeping proper financial records and collecting payments from clients.

He claimed that a number of the company's clients complained that nobody reminded them to make payments.

He said this caused embarrassment to the company because it failed to pay employees on time. The matter is pending before court.

COMESA ministers discuss regional security

MINISTERS of foreign affairs from COMESA member states met in Madagascar ahead of the 19th Summit of the heads of state which started yesterday.

The main agenda of the meeting was to review peace and security in the COMESA region.

COMESA is the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa.

Prime Minister of Madagascar Mahafaly Soloandrasana Olivier opened the meeting which was also addressed by Secretary General of COMESA Sindiso Ngwenya.

Olivier expressed his country's appreciation for the support provided by the regional grouping to return to democratic order after a period of political instability in the past.

Crisis

He said the Madagascar political crisis provided useful lessons to the region on the need to consolidate peace without which economic development cannot be realised.

On that note, the COMESA secretary general informed the ministers that the regional bloc had put in place crisis prevention measures to detect simmering conflicts.

"We have put in place a robust early warning system on conflicts in the region known as COMWARN and completed our first structural vulnerability assessments which we disseminated to all countries last year," he announced,

adding that this would contribute to finding lasting peace in the region.

He said, in addition, that 16 trade information desks had been established under COMESA's post conflict programme.

This has reinforced trade and investment in the Great Lakes region and as a result, thousands of small scale traders could obtain accurate and reliable information at the border areas thus facilitating cross border trade.

"We are now at an advanced stage of establishing five border

markets and access roads in the same region with an estimated budget of approximately five million Euros, mobilised from partners," Ngwenya said.

Focus

"This focus has become a niche for COMESA because we recognise that peace processes do not end with the signing of agreements but the phase that follows is critical for ensuring lasting peace," he

Other peace building initiatives by the regional bloc include sup-

port to 10 countries affected the most by maritime piracy.

Under this initiative, Ngwenya said COMESA was strengthening their capacity to fight financial crimes that result from piracy and other predicate offenses, as well as ensure that the illegally gotten money does not further perpetrate these crimes.

On that note, the Prime Minister of Madagascar said his country has now been admitted to the East and Southern Africa Anti-Money Laundering Group (ESAAMLG),

which is a requirement of all jurisdictions fighting money laundering.

The admission was facilitated through the COMESA Maritime Security Programme (MASE) funded by the European Union.

MASE is implemented in 10 countries that were most vulnerable to piracy attacks including Comoros, Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Seychelles, Somalia and Tanzania.

Its overall objective is to fight piracy and other maritime threats.

Chinese, Indian currencies to be used in COMESA

THE Chinese Yuan and Indian Rupee will be included in the Regional Payment and Settlement System (REPSS) operated by the COMESA clearing house as mode of payments.

Currently, the United States dollar and the euro are the only two international currencies used in COMESA with provision for the British Pound, Japanese Yen and the Swiss Franc.

COMESA Clearing House Director Mahmood Mansoor told delegates attending the 36th Intergovernmental Committee Meeting in Madagascar that the inclusion of the two currencies followed the decision by Central Bank governors from the region during their meeting in August this year.

"This inclusion as the sixth and seventh settlement currencies would make REPSS more robust and meet the growing needs of payments and settlements in the fast changing financial world," he said.

REPSS is a Multilateral Netting System with end-of-day settlement in a single currency.

It provides a single gateway for Central Banks within the region to effect payment in a multicurrency environment (US\$, Euro or any other specified currency).

Importers and exporters are therefore able to pay and receive payment

for goods and services through an efficient and cost effective platform thus increase intra-regional trade. The direct participants of the COMESA Clearing House are the Central Banks of Member States.

Mansoor said the two currencies would reduce the requirements for US dollars in trade with China and India and also in the Intra-COMESA and regional trade. This would greatly facilitate COMESA and non-COMESA member states.

Member states have steadily been using the REPSS which currently has eight Central Banks live on the platform.

The value of transactions processed on the system reached nearly E182m (\$14m) and E15m (€1m) as at August 2016.

The use of REPSS was expected to grow as the Central Banks of Egypt and Sudan are poised to begin live operations soon. Currently, Central Banks of DRC, Kenya, Malawi, Mauritius, Rwanda, Sudan, Uganda and Zambia are operating on the system

In the meeting of governors,
COMESA Secretary General Sindiso
Ngwenya was asked to lead a Task
Force comprising of the COMESA
Clearing House, PTA Bank, COMESA Business Council and any other
relevant COMESA Institution, to
work in collaboration with Central
Banks and main exporters and
importers to channel all their payments/receipts through REPSS.

The Secretary General would also liaise with Afreximbank to use the Clearing House for their intra-COMESA transactions.

organisation found it necessary to engage the people on how the current situation could be overcome.

When making a presentation on the subject, Ndwandwe said the current situation of poor waste management contributed immensely to climate

Ndwandwe pointed out even though government has put in place some legislation to prevent littering,

enough, hence the need to have them amended.

He said there had been disturbing instances where some companies were reported to be disposing industrial waste to rivers which were also used by the public.

He said such practices were not only a health hazard to humans but also affected the environment.

The inappropriate disposal of clinical waste was said to be another issue which has left the environment hazardous to its habitants. Some highly infectious waste from various health institutions were said to be disposed at the main dump sites instead of being separated and disposed in a specific manner.

Ndwandwe said however, the ministry had made several interventions such as hosting clean up campaigns in various areas.

He said such initiatives however needed the collaboration of all other sectors for it to bring the desired fruits. It was said the national Indaba therefore, seek to reflect at the challenges and propose possible actions to overcome them.

'Sound waste management a prerequisite of first world status'

PRIME Minister Sibusiso Dlamini has said one of the prerequisite for the country to attain the first world status is making sure sound waste management is put in place.

Dlamini was represented by the Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Christopher Gamedze during the official launch of the Waste Management Indaba.

The prime minister highlighted the country needs to make swift interventions towards poor waste management in the society.

He said on this platform, members of the public are requested to deliberate and bring forth opinions on what the country can do to address the problem of poor waste management at household, community, chiefdom, constituency, town and regional level.

However, the prime minister said it was evident the problem also presented a huge business opportunity as almost 80 percent of waste generated in the country can be safely recycled and reused to stimulate economic growth.

He said the challenges of waste management could be turned into an opportunity for communities to create jobs and economic activities by exploring opportunities to set up waste recycling centres across the country

Meanwhile, the prime minister said government economic strategy affirmed that tourism could play a crucial role in accelerating economic growth in the country.

He said for this reason, government would consider submissions to be made by the people on the dialogue to be conducted regionally.

CALL FOR DISPOSABLE NAPPIES BAN

THE issue of disposable nappies was one of the burning issues amongst participants of the Waste Management Indaba yesterday at Matsetsa School for the Deaf as some were of the view that the government must ban the use of dia-

This was after the participants were given time to deliberate on the contributing factors of poor waste management in the society. Some participants stated that the nation must consider bringing back the use of reusable nappies.

Some of the participants however stated that the use of disposable nappies must not be totally banned but there must be a way of using them on special occasions. This was however submissions made by mainly the male participants while female

participants said there must be a proper way of disposing such nappies.

Meanwhile, Chief Maliwa Maziya called for parliament to endorse the initiative of selling plastic bags by shops to minimise litter. Maziya said another option to minimise waste would be introducing paper bags for carrying groceries as opposed to the use of use of plastic bags.

Tourism minister has nothing to say

NEWLY appointed Minister of Tourism and **Environmental Affairs** Christopher Gamedze had nothing to say during the launch of the National Waste Management Indaba at Matsetsa School for the Deaf yesterday.

Gamedze only presented the prime minister's speech which was to mark the official launch by reading it before retiring back to his seat.

It was then the minister highlighted he was still new in the ministry and was not very clear on what to say, much to the amusement of the attendees. Apparently, this was Gamedze's first official assignment as a minister after his appointment.

The two teenagers, *Sanele and *Musa who attend school in one of the local schools and Mancoba Ndzimandze were charged with house breaking and theft. They are said to have acted in a common purpose and wrongfully, unlawfully and intentionally broken into a shop belonging to Syde Atif Hussain and stolen items of the said amount.

The accused persons were said to have stolen mainly cellphones which were kept in the shop. According to the complainant, the cellphones were brought by clients for repairs. When the charge sheet was read to them, each of the accused persons pleaded guilty to the charge. The crown also accepted the pleas

without leading evidence to prove commission of the crime.

During mitigation, the accused persons stated they were actually under the influence of alcohol when they committed the crime.

They said they did not plan to commit the offence as they also did not need the cellphones. The first accused also stated he was doing his Form One.

When issuing sentence, Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso stated the accused had committed a serious crime. Mavuso then sentenced the accused to a year in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine

Meanwhile, Bonginkosi Matsanjwa appeared before Principal Magistrate Dumsani Magagula where he also faced a charge of house breaking and theft. He was alleged to have broken into a house belonging to Jabulile Ndzinisa and stolen items valued at E3 500.

The accused pleaded guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence. He was accordingly found guilty by the court after his plea was accepted by the crown. When delivering sentence, Magagula pointed out such offences were prevalent in the region.

He said this showed the sentences issued by the court were not stiff enough to act as a deterrent to offenders. Magagula then sentenced the accused to five years in a correctional facility without an option of a fine.

Businessman asks court to be quick on his trial

LOMAHASHA Businessman Joseph Mtshali (48) has asked Principal Magistrate Dumsani Magagula to treat his case as a matter of urgency.

Mtshali is facing charges of contravening the theft of motor vehicle act. The accused who owns a fleet of trucks had one of the trucks impounded by police last year after he had brought it to them for the processing of its

He was eventually charged for contravening Section 9 of the theft of motor vehicle Act 16 of 1991. He was alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully tempered with the vehicle's

engine number.

He was further charged with a similar charge in that he wrongfully and unlawfully drove the motor vehicle which had false registration marks.

Police alleged the truck was stolen from South Africa. At some instance in July, the court ordered the police to release the vehicle to Mtshali after South African police submitted a report which stated the vehicle had not been reported to be stolen.

Mtshali had also told the court he bought the vehicle from a South African garage which had a branch in Matsapha.

The police, however, insisted in preferring charges and keeping the vehicle. Yesterday, Mtshali was back in court for trial. The crown, however, asked for a postponement of the matter, saying it was not ready for the trial.

Mtshali then asked the court to have a way of concluding the matter urgently, saying he was losing business due to the detention of the vehicle. He stated he has already lost some clients which he used to serve using the detained truck.

The matter was eventually set for trial on November 4, 2016.

Mzuthini applauds media as nother escapee arrested

HIS Majesty's Correctional Services Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase has applauded the media for its relentless efforts in disseminating information which has led to the arrest of three suspects who escaped at Big Bend Correctional Centre last Friday.

According to Ntshangase, the cooperation between the media and the department was evident he also said the media were indeed heroes in the fight against crime and such efforts could not go unnoticed.

Sensitising

The commissioner general specifically thanked the efforts by the Swazi Observer, Swaziland Broadcasting and Information Services (SBIS) and Times of Swaziland for playing a mammoth role in sensitising the nation about the escaped suspects through publicising the unfortunate incident.

Information provided by the media has led to the re-arrest of another escapee at Ekhwezi area under Lubuli Inkhundla yesterday. This brings the number of apprehended escapees to three. Benson Shabalala was apprehended by Correctional officers while around the area despite his attempts to evade the officers upon noticing their presence.

The first two inmates, Mancoba Sibandze and Mpendulo Dlamini were re-arrested at KaLanga area on Sunday.

Following the dramatic escape of the seven inmates at the Big-Bend Correctional Centre last Friday and the re-arrest of the three suspects, Ntshangase also expressed his deepest appreciation to the joint operation between the Royal Swaziland Police Service and His Majesty's Correctional Services officers for their key role in the capture of the three fugi-

Appreciate

However, Ntshangase further mentioned that despite this achievement, officers were still hot on the heels of the four who remain at large.

The Commissioner General also took time to appreciate the support from members of the public, who have played a significant role in providing vital information leading to the rearrest of the escapees.

"They can run but will never elude the long arm of the law," he said.

Preliminary evidence indicates the seven inmates who were kept in the remand wing of the Big-Bend centre used metal objects to gain freedom through a burglar window. However, Ntshangase mentioned that full investigations on how this unfortunate incident unfolded were still underway and promised that when the process of investigation is finished and results are known, appropriate measures would be taken to ensure such does not happen in the

The commissioner general further appealed to the public for assistance in the quest to bring to book the remaining four fugitives.

These fugitives are; Sibusiso Masuku, Banele Dlamini, Sphamandla Dlamini, and Wandile

He further urged these individuals to hand themselves to the police and be men enough to face consequences of their alleged criminal

The escaped convicts face charges such as house-breaking, murder, rape, and car hijack-

On another note, Ntshangase expressed appreciation to inmates who are already serving their time and those awaiting trial for cooperating with the department in discharging its mandate of keeping offenders in human custodial conditions, while also ensuring their proper transforming through rehabilitation programmes.





SWAZI RAILWAY NETS E1.7M MONTH FROM INSURANCE

SWAZILAND Railway Chief Financial Officer Vusi Makhubu has revealed that after the tragic accident which occurred at Mpaka last year, the entity is raking in around E1.7 million a month from the insurance company as com-

This will happen until the locomotives are fully repaired.

Makhubu said during the time of the accident, it took about three days to get the accident cleared and for the route to be used again.

He said since the line was used by about five trains, the company made a huge revenue loss which amounted to about E675 000 per day for about

Makhubu said he could not confirm whether it was for five or three days as the accident happened some time back and he could not recall clearly the number of days.

He said the company made a loss of E40 million as a result of the accident. The chief financial officer stated that the company's financial woes might be far from over as they had not even received the bill from South Africa yet as one of the locomotives that was damaged belonged to Transnet.

Makhubu said the possibility of the insurer saying Swailand Railway

was responsible for the cause of the accident cannot be ruled out.

He said if that happened they would be forced to pay up for the damages and stated that South Africa has not yet given them the bill. Makhubu said this was not the first time Transnet has taken long to submit invoices.

He said such happened in 2014 whereby there was an accident and they waited for their counterpart to submit invoices but that never happened.

Makhubu said they might be forced to write that accident off their records since it has been a long time

because they did not get feedback from South Africa.

Even though no invoices had been submitted by South Africa, they as a company do make a provision that if it happens that they are taken to task they are ready for that financially.

The accident had negative impacts financially for the company.

He said even though the insurance company has renewed its contract with them, premiums had gone up.

Makhubu said for about 10 years, the company had no accidents and since they were not making any claims the premiums were going

... Company sets up deadly derailer to detour runaway trains

SWAZILAND Railway Company Chief Financial Officer Vusi Makhubu got the shock of his life on Tuesday when he was informed by the Mpaka Accident Commission of Enquiry that what the company has put in place as means to curb a similar accident as that of last year from occurring is actually not a solution but another problem.

The revelation was made after Makhubu informed the probe members that the company had made great strides by setting up a derailer that would divert runaway trains to the wilderness so that they do not cause accidents at the station damaging other stationed locomotives.

The commission of enquiry asked Makhubu if the engineers who developed the derailer consulted with the people who were on the safety board at Swazi Railway to which Makhubu said they did not engage them fully.

It was then brought to Makhubu's attention that the enquiry team has received information that the derailer that has been set up is not a solution but a serious problem.

Makhubu was told that the derailer does not allow the driver to have enough time to try



and stop the train but it merely detours the train.

The commission highlighted that when that happens they have since learnt that it is highly possible that the train upon being derailed would crash, leading to locomotives piling up on each other which is something that will see the company incurring more loss.

Such news left Makhubu dumbfounded as he revealed that he did not know about such. He said all that he was excited about was that the company was making great strides in ensuring that such an unfortunate accident never happens again.

Makhubu said such developments have even led to the insurance company renewing their contract with the rail company since they noted that they were improving on safety.

UMBUTFO Swaziland Defence Force (USDF) has come out strongly against The Covenant of Jesus **Christ Ministries Bishop Enoch** Maseko, saying he is not the authorised official USDF Chief Chaplain.

This comes after reports that the Bishop in his capacity as the local chief coordinator hosted a conference for all chaplains in the country recently. It is said during these conferences chaplains from the different security forces around the country attended.

This move did not go down well with the army as the Army Public Relations Officer Colonel Wilfred Dlamini issued a statement saying the Army would like to make it clear that the authorised official USDF Chief Chaplain is Colonel Sabelo Maseko not Second Lieutanent Enoch Maseko.

Conduct

Dlamini said the bishop had no authority to conduct any chaplaincy duties in the name of the USDF but can only do so in his private civilian pastoral duties.

Dlamini advised other forces namely the Royal Swaziland Police Services and His Majesty's Correctional

Services, the entire Christian fraternity and the general public that those doing business with the bishop will engage in a personal private civilian business not on official USDF duties at all.

The public relations officer stated that all USDF activities must be liaised and channeled through the rightful authorised USDF Chief

Chaplain Colonel Sabelo Maseko. Bishop Maseko of The Covenent of Jesus Christ Ministries was quoted by this publication during one of his workshops as having said that the current perception is that chaplains are just reserved for security forces and only responsible for leading funerals in their different forces.

Maseko stated that every institution must have their own chaplains.

HOME AFFAIRS OFFICER SLAPPED WITH CONTEMPT OF COURT

AN officer at the ministry of home affairs has been slapped with a contempt of court charge for the fourth time after failing to repay a defendant which he had conned.

Emmanuel Phathaphatha
Gamedze (54) was slapped with
contempt of court after failing to
compensate Mduduzi Nkhambule
money totaling E20 000 which he
allegedly stole from him using false

pretences

Gamedze is a senior officer in the ministry of home affairs under the Births, Marriages and Deaths (BMD) department in the Lubombo offices.

He was first arrested early last year and charged with theft by false pretences.

He was alleged to have misrepresented himself to Nkhambule and promised to sell him a piece of land if he paid him E20 000.

It is said he collected the said amount while knowing that he had no intention of selling the said land as he did not own it.

Gamedze pleaded guilty to the charge and was accordingly found guilty by the court after the crown presented evidence to prove commission of the crime.

The court then ordered the accused person to compensate the complainant while sentencing was deferred pending the compensation. Gamedze was allowed to pay in monthly installments until completion of the payment which was due in December.

However, Gamedze has been

coming to court on several occasions to report that he was failing to pay back the money and would ask for extension of dates.

On Tuesday, Gamedze appeared before Principal Magistrate Dumsani Magagula where he was facing the contempt charge. He was said to have failed to present proof of payment for his monthly installments as ordered by the court.

Gamedze was said to have also given misleading information to the court during his previous arrest on a similar charge.

He is said to have asked the court to release him so that he would process payment for the August installment, upon which he was to return to court later on the same day to present proof of payment. However, Gamedze did not return on the said day.

The principal magistrate said the court was now compelled to issue a sentence on the case of theft by false pretense before even considering the latest charge of contempt of court.

Magagula said the law dictated that the accused must now be remanded in custody, but considering that he was now almost an elderly and deployed just next to the court, he was to be remanded out of custody.

Magagula then warned the accused to return to court today to get his sentence on the initial charge.

MYSTERIOUS FIRE BURNS DOWN WIDOW'S HOUSE

PROPERTY worth over E50 000 belonging to a widow at Khuphuka was burnt down after a house mysteriously caught fire.

Khuphuka is under Hlane constituency, an area which is facing serious effects of the El Nino induced drought.

The one-roomed house was used by a Zikalala family as the main house which kept important items such as food, clothing and school books which belonged to Alexinah Zikalala's grandchildren.

When reporting about the incident, Zikalala said she had left her elder daughter, Sindi who recently graduated at the University of Swaziland last Saturday earlier on the day to get her share of the ongoing food distribution in the area.

She said while away from the homestead, she received a call informing her about the incident which has since left the family without shelter.

Zikalala said her daughter reported that a mysterious fire started from the roof of the house while she was in another house nearby. She said it was not known what could have




started the fire as there was no source of fire nor electricity in the house. The fire quickly engulfed the entire house and burnt down everything inside.

Items

Zikalala reported that some of the important items which were burnt included academic certificates which belonged to her grandchildren. "I just have nothing left as almost everything was inside the burnt house," said Zikalala.

Meanwhile, Hlane MP George Maseko pleaded with members of the public to assist the family to have at least a temporary structure and food. Maseko was called to the homestead immediately after the incident.

"The family is in serious need for help and we appeal to members of the public to assist especially with food parcels," said Maseko.

COMESA FOREIGN AFFAIRS MINISTERS TACKLE

REGIONAL SECURITY

MINISTERS of Foreign Affairs from COMESA Member States met in Madagascar ahead of the entity's 19th summit of the heads of state before the end of the week.

The main agenda of the meeting was to review peace and security situation in the COMESA region.

COMESA is the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa.

Prime Minister of Madagascar Mahafaly Soloandrasana Olivier opened the meeting which was also addressed by Secretary General of COMESA Sindiso Ngwenya.

The PM expressed his country's appreciation for the support provided by the regional grouping to return to democratic order after a period of political instability in the

He said the Madagascar political crisis provided useful lessons to the region on the need to consolidate peace without which economic development cannot be realised.



On that note, COMESA SG informed the ministers the regional bloc had put in place crisis prevention measures to detect simmering conflicts.

"We have put in place a robust early warning system on conflicts in the region known as COMWARN and completed our first structural vulnerability assessments which we disseminated to all countries last year," he announced adding this would contribute to finding lasting peace in the region.

He said, in addition, 16 trade information desks had been established under COMESA's post conflict programme.

This has reinforced trade and

investment in the Great Lakes region and as a result, thousands of small scale traders could obtain accurate and reliable information at the border areas thus facilitating cross border trade.

"We are now at an advanced stage of establishing five border markets and access roads in the same region with an estimated budget of approximately five million euros, mobilised from partners," Ngwenya said.

"This focus has become a niche for COMESA because we recognise that peace processes do not end with the signing of agreements but the phase that follows is critical for ensuring lasting peace."

Chinese, Indian currencies join the COMESA system

THE Chinese Yuan and the Indian Rupee will be included in the Regional Payment and Settlement System (REPSS) operated by the COMESA clearing house as mode of payments.

Currently, the United States dollar and the Euro are the only two international currencies used on the system with provision for the British Pound, Japanese Yen and the Swiss Franc.

COMESA Clearing House
Director Mahmood Mansoor told
delegates attending the 36th
Intergovernmental committee
meeting in Madagascar the inclusion of the two currencies followed the decision by Central
Bank governors from the region
during their meeting in August
this year.

"This inclusion as the sixth and seventh settlement currencies would make REPSS more robust and meet the growing needs of payments and settlements in the fast changing financial world," he said.

Multicurrency

REPSS is a Multilateral Netting System with end-of-day settlement in a single currency. It provides a single gateway for Central Banks within the region to effect payment in a multicurrency environment (US\$, Euro or any other specified currency).

Importers and exporters are therefore able to pay and receive payment for goods and services through an efficient and cost effective platform thus increase intra-regional trade. The direct

Other peace building initiatives by the regional bloc include support to 10 countries affected the most by maritime piracy.

Under this initiative, Ngwenya said COMESA was strengthening their capacity to fight financial crimes that result from piracy and other predicate offenses, as well as ensure that the illegally gotten money does not further perpetrate these crimes.

On that note, the Prime Minister said Madagascar has now been admitted to the East and Southern Africa Anti-Money Laundering participants of the COMESA Clearing House are the Central Banks of Member States

Mansoor said the two currencies would reduce the requirements for US dollars in trade with China and India and also in the Intra-COMESA and regional trade. This would greatly facilitate COMESA and non-COMESA member states.

Member states have steadily been using the REPSS which currently has eight Central Banks live on the platform. The value of transactions processed on the system reached nearly E182m (US\$14m) and E15m (€1m) on August 2016.

Operations

The use of REPSS was expected to grow as the Central Banks of Egypt and Sudan are poised to begin live operations soon.
Currently, Central Banks of DRC, Kenya, Malawi, Mauritius, Rwanda, Sudan, Uganda and Zambia are operating on the system.

In the meeting of Governors, COMESA Secretary General Sindiso Ngwenya was asked to lead a Task Force comprising of the COMESA Clearing House, PTA Bank, COMESA Business Council and any other relevant COMESA Institution, to work in collaboration with Central Banks and main exporters and importers to channel all their payments or receipts through REPSS.

The Secretary General would also liaise with Afreximbank to use the Clearing House for their intra-COMESA transactions.

Group (ESAAMLG), which is a requirement of all jurisdictions fighting money laundering. The admission was facilitated through the COMESA Maritime Security Programme (MASE) funded by the European Union.

MASE is implemented in 10 countries that were most vulnerable to piracy attacks including Comoros, Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Seychelles, Somalia and Tanzania.

Its overall objective is to fight piracy and other maritime threats.

70 HOMESTEADS HAD ROOFS BLOWN OFF BY STRONG WIND

CLOSE to 70 homesteads under the Matsanjeni constituency have been identified as among those that were affected by the strong winds which engulfed surrounding areas on Sunday.

As Inkhundla, we will avail ourselves and try to assist," said the MP. Despite the strong winds, there was however, no life lost. He said it was a setback for some families, while others are still trying to recover from the effects of drought.

"It is a double blow for some families, we are appealing to organisations as well as to companies to assist in whatever way as government alone cannot manage to do everything. It is important in situations like this, we all stand up and provide help to those affected as this disaster is not work of humans but it's nature which cannot be avoided," said MP Masuku.

People who suffer from stammering speech to get govt grants

PEOPLE who suffer from stammering will receive disability grants from government and they should not be discriminated.

Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Principal Secretary Khangeziwe Mabuza said stuttering or stammering was considered a speaking disability by the United Nations (UN).

The PS was presenting on the People Living with Disability Bill 2015 before 13 senators at the Pigg's Peak hotel on Tuesday.

"Stuttering or stammering is considered as a speaking disability by UN so it does qualify as such and people who do suffer from stuttering speech will qualify for the proposed government disability grants," she said. Mabuza said stuttering speech was often a condition people acquired during their life span and not at birth.

"Stuttering or stammering is a speech disability that most people are not born with but acquire it as they grow older for a number of varying reasons," she said.

Mabuza said currently people living with albinism were at logger-heads and seemed to be discriminating amongst themselves which was worrying as people with albinism had two separate organisations. "It is unfortunate Swaziland has two separate people with albinism organisations, this creates an impression


part of the donation which took place on Tuesday.

THE United Nations General Assembly (UNGASS) agreed in June 2016, that ending AIDS globally by 2030 requires a Fast-Track response to reach three milestones by 2020: Reduce new HIV infections to fewer than 500 000; Reduce AIDS-related deaths to fewer than 500 000; and Eliminate HIV-related stigma and discrimination.

The UNGASS further provided five pillars for achieving less than 500 000 new infections globally by 2020. These are:

Combination prevention, including comprehensive sexuality education, economic empowerment and access to sexual and reproductive health services for young women and adolescent girls and their male partners in high prevalence locations.

 Evidence-informed and human rights-based prevention programmes for key populations, including dedicated services and community mobilisation and empowerment.

Strengthened national condom programmes, including procurement, distribution, social marketing, privatesector sales and demand creation.

 Voluntary medical male circumcision in priority countries that have high levels of HIV prevalence and low levels of male circumcision, as part of wider sexual and reproductive health service provision for boys and

Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for population groups at higher risk of HIV infection.

In the wake of the UNAIDS Prevention Gap Report that shows the decline in new HIV infections among adults has stalled (an estimated 1.9 million became infected with HIV every year during the past five years and rising in some regions) there is need to reinvigorate HIV prevention efforts so as to stay on the Fast-Track to ending the AIDS epidemic.

HIV PREVENTION PROGRAMMES

CONDOMS FOR THE PREVENTION OF

IN SWAZILAND

The country has nine (9) priority prevention programmes: HIV Testing and Counseling (HTC); Social and Behavior Change (SBC); Condom Promotion and Distribution; Prevention of Mother-to-Child Transmission (PMTCT); Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision (VMMC); Customised Interventions for Key Populations and Vulnerable Groups; Pre Antiretroviral Therapy (Pre-ART); Antiretroviral Treatment (ART for PLHIV); and TB/HIV Co-Infection.

At a recent breakfast meeting with the private sector, the National Emergency Response Council on HIV and AIDS (NERCHA) Executive Director, Khanya Mabuza indicated that new HIV infections were now at 11 402. He further stated that the HIV prevalence is increasing among younger

women, aged between 18-24, something that can be attributed to the increased HIV risk exposure as seen in the 2013 Swaziland Health Statistics by

UNICEF which

states that among young people aged 15-24, condom use with multiple partners to be at 84.5% for males and 68.6% for females. In addition, 15.2 % of women aged 15-49 years have unmet needs for contraception, leading to approximately 200 unintended pregnancies, whose consequence is revealed in the confidential enquiry into maternal deaths triennial report 2011-2013 which shows that from the maternal deaths audited, abortion attributes to 9% of all deaths. These three public health priorities require a decisive response using all available tools, with condoms playing a central role.

CONDOM PROMOTION AND DISTRIBUTION

Condoms are an important component of a comprehensive and sustainable approach to the prevention of HIV and other sexually transmitted infections (STIs), and are effective for preventing unplanned pregnancies. They are however just one component, a combination prevention strategy which advocates for a holistic approach to HIV prevention by also bringing into play, the simultaneous use of complementary HIV prevention strategies.

These include those that seek to reduce the risk of HIV transmission by addressing risky behaviours (behavioural); strategies that use a mix of clinical and medical approaches to reduce transmission (biomed-

ical); and those that seek to address underlying factors that make individuals or groups vulnerable to HIV infection (structural), with gender and human

> rights dimensions mainstreamed in all aspects, as critical enablers. To ensure increased correct and consistent use of

active people, the country has as part of its HIV prevention programmes, condom promotion and distribution.

condoms by all sexually

This is strategic, given that nationally about 90% of all new infections occur through heterosexual contact (Modes of Transmission 2009).

The condom promotion and distribution programme targets individuals at high risk, venues frequented by high-risk individuals, communities at greatest risk for HIV infection, especially those marginalised by social, economic, or structural conditions, and the general population within jurisdictions with high HIV incidence.

The supply and availability of both

male and female condoms is critical as it allows for their access and use of the commodities. Currently, programmers are unable to determine consistent use of condoms by the population so the concentration is on the availability of condoms through countrywide distribution. The country target for the current financial year is to distribute around 14 million condoms, and the National Quarterly Service Coverage Report (April to June 2016) shows that there were 3 873 844 condoms distributed in the quarter. There were 3 818 307 male condoms and 55 537 female condoms distributed.

OTHER DYNAMICS

It is important to note that there is no scientific evidence that promoting the correct and consistent use of condoms leads to alterations in sexual behaviour or increased risk taking.

For individuals that practice correct and consistent condom use, there is need to also emphasise the need to make use of available couple HIV testing and counseling services so as to know own HIV status and that of the regular sex partner. Further, voluntary medical male circumcision protects against acquisition of HIV in men who are circumcised, therefore men should consider doubling their defense by circumcising and continue to consistently and correctly use a condom.

There is need too, to reduce the number of sex partners as well as consider abstinence in certain age groups and for those that may choose it -for some choose that method of protection. At national level, the control of other sexually transmitted infections, particularly in high risk groups like sex workers and men who have sex with men, is important.

It is imperative that everyone begins to realise that life matters enough to want to protect self and the person they love.

Condoms can play a big part (even is serodiscordant couples) so if sexually active, choose wisely - use a condom, correctly and every time.

FACTS ABOUT CONDOMS

 Condoms prevent transmission by reducing the risk that an exposure to HIV or STIs occurs during sex. Laboratory studies show that the materials used to make most condoms do not allow bacteria, viruses or other germs to pass through them. Therefore, condoms act as a barrier to HIV and STI infection by preventing the mouth, vagina, penis and rectum from being exposed to:

 Bodily fluids (such as semen, vaginal fluid and rectal fluid) that can contain HIVand STIs; and/or

 Skin infected by an STI (such as herpes and syphilis sores or genital warts). Condoms can be highly effective against HIV and STI transmission when used consistently and correctly but are much less protective if used inconsistently and/or incorrectly

There are 2 types of condoms available to prevent the sexual transmission of HIV and other STIs:

• The male condom - Also known as the external condom, is a sheath made from polyurethane, latex, or polyisoprene that covers the penis during sexual intercourse. There are many types and brands of male condoms available, that vary in shape, colour, size, texture and flavour.

The female condom - Also known as the internal or insertive condom, or a femidom, is a pouch made of polyurethane (FC1 condom) or a synthetic latex material called nitrile (FC2 condom). The pouch is open at one end and closed at the other end. It has a flexible ring at both ends. The ring at the closed end is used to insert the condom into the vagina and hold it in place. The ring at the open end of the pouch remains outside of the vagina and covers the external parts of the female genitalia.

 Some condoms are made from a thin membrane of sheep intestine, also known as lambskin condoms. These condoms are not effective at reducing the risk of HIV or STI transmission because bacteria, viruses and other germs can pass through this membrane.



The determination to make it as the girls shared what it meant to them to be a powerful woman was moving.

WLSA national director Colani Hlatjwako was an inspiration and had the audience hanging on her every word as she shared how she was able to break the mould and

make a name for herself despite her humble background. He said as a community they were not proud of this which is why they were working hard to end violence not only in Mhlangeni, but in the whole country.


US Ambassador, Her Excellency Lisa Peterson said girls from Mhlangeni could still become powerful girls regardless of the circumstances they found themselves in.

She listed the ingredients to becoming successful to be resilience, determination and safety.


Referring to Rosa Parks background, she said that everything that happens in one's life usually prepares them for that moment when they become something and that is where the experience from those situations comes in handy.

KOBWA SPREADING WA PRESERVATION GOSPEL



Komati Basin Water Authority (KOBWA) recently hosted a high schools water conservation contest, under the auspices of the project: Water and **Environmental Management** Campaign.

The pupils were competing on best water preservation models.

The competition focused on schools within KOBWA's domain in Northern Hhohho.

The pupils highlighted the dreadful effects of drought. The historic drying up of the Hawane dam and strict water rationing for Mbabane residents were quoted as moral examples.

Acting Senior Inspector for Agriculture Bongane Siyaya who was one of the judges -represented Senior Inspector for Science noted that the El Nino drought exposed the country and the drying of the capital city's water taps was a humiliating experience for the Mbabane residents.

Water access is a human rights issue and Siyaya added that in an ideal situation, no part of the country should have scarce supply of water.

The talk that some parts of the

country are used to protracted spells of drought is discouraged. It shouldn't be like that," he said, adding: "even in Lavumisa they should have water. Sustainable water supply should be for everyone not for a few."

Siyaya applauded KOBWA for investing in Swaziland's future water scientists and engineers. He noted that if wishes were horses, the country at large could benefit if the contest could be expanded to other regions of the country.

He said because the schools are within the Komati-Lomati basin, they know what they are talking about. He said the good ideas expressed in the models can be used at both household and industrial levels.

"We are clear as a country that we can't get quality education without making quality investment in education. As we invest in this quality education, it is going to take us somewhere. As somebody else has pointed out that Hawane dam was poorly designed, we empower these future generations' skills to design better dams.

"With such quality investment we must do something better in future. Should the drought come in the next ten or 15 years, we should not suffer the same way we have suffered now," he said.

Water engineer at KOBWA, Sakhiwe Nkomo said through the school programme they effect change of the pupils behaviour at an early age.

...The pupils highlighted the dreadful effects of

The pupils are still young and have innovative minds. They are able to think outside the box, it is important to teach them water management at this stage unlike some of us who have learnt about such issues when already adults," said Nkomo.

He made strong emphasis on the importance of water conservation owing to the prevailing conditions of drought. Nkomo revealed that Maguga dam's current capacity has fallen to 17 percent while Driekoppies dam capacity has fallen to 25 percent.

He said the water is used for both agriculture and domestic activities. And,10 percent of the water at Driekoppies dam is for domestic use and the rest is for irrigation.

"So far, it's only agriculture that has been rationed water. The sector gets 20 percent of the existing capacity. If the condition persists, we might start to ration water for domestic use just like in Mbabane.

Nkomo concurred with Siyaya that to expand the programme would be valuable to the country but because KOBWA is limited in scope they would need to partner with other stakeholders.

"We are confined to the Komati Basin at Hhohho. Maybe if it can be initiated by other agencies we can buy in," said Nkomo

Emagobodvo High School came first in the water conservation competition. The school got a desktop computer and the individual pupils got gold medals and trophies. The runners-up were Nkonyeni High School. The

school got a printer which also acts as a photocopier and scanner. Pupils received silver medals as individuals, portable DVD players and trophies.

Third place was a tie between Mbeka Anglican and Malibeni High Schools. Each school got a DVD player and learners got binoculars and bronze medals."

Although the schools presented different projects in the competition, however, they shared common features in their functions. Basically, models focused mainly on water harvesting and purification for domestic use.

Filtering innovations like charcoal, sand, loam soil, gravel, ash are one of the many items pupils recommended to be used in purifying grey water for household

In agreement with Nkomo, United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Manager on Climate Change Adaptation, Ncamiso Mhlanga said the models by the schools are of convenient use at domestic setting.

He was also impressed by the projects write-ups which gave details about the projects and they corresponded well with the models.

"As judges we also looked at the cost effectiveness in terms of implementing those models. I must say we need all the models by the schools to harvest and conserve water.

More especially applicable in homestead level because most of the challenges are faced at household level because companies have mitigation measures. There is a great potential for schools this side with more time we could come up with something more tangible," said Mhlanga

MINERALS SHOULD CONTRIBUTE E1.8 BILLION BY 2018 - MINISTER

THE mining and minerals sector must strive to contribute more than four per cent to the gross domestic product of this country by 2018 onwards.

Minister of Natural Resources and Energy Jabulile Mashwama said Vision 2022 of His Majesty Mswati III laid a milestone objective that Swaziland must thrive to attain a first world status by the year 2022 and the ministry in its Strategic Plan 2014-2018, set this as one of its objectives.

"In the opening of Lomati Mine by His Majesty King Mswati III, he said minerals extracted from within borders of Swaziland must be subjected to minerals value chain that will see a creation of secondary and tertiary industries using the country's minerals endowment," she said.

The Minister of Natural Resources and Energy Jabulile Mashwama was speaking through Minister of Natural Resources and Energy Principal Secretary Winnie Stewart at the consultation exercise hosted by the Common Wealth Secretariat: Oceans and Natural Division held at Sibane Hotel yesterday.

Mashwama said the country as a member of the Southern Africa development Community (SADC) subscribes to the SADC Protocol of Mining of which His Majesty duly signed in 2007.

"The Protocol encourages

....Vibrant mining and minerals sector vital for employment opportunities

MINISTER of Natural Resources and Energy Jabulile Mashwama said a vibrant mining and minerals sector will contribute to employment opportunities, diverse skills and contract service providers among other benefits.

"These benefits cut across a variety of sectors that include education and training and will result in a large pool of skilled labour force for the mining and minerals subsector.

Consequently, there shall be enhanced productivity at the mines and beneficiation facilities," she said.

The minister said she was grateful to His Majesty King Mswati III and government for recognising that the minerals sector has a potential to contribute to the domestic gross domestic product and thus improve the lives and livelihoods of citizens of this country.

"The government is also grateful to the Oceans and Natural Resources Advisory Division of an inclusive Commonwealth Secretariat that commenced the first phase of the mining legislation review exercise in 2001 that culminated in the National Mining Policy in 2003," she said.

Mashwama said The Oceans and Natural Resources Advisory Division further produced

the final Bills that led to the formulation of the Mines and Minerals Act 2011 and Diamond Act 2011.

According to the African Development Bank, coal reserves for Swaziland were estimated at about 158 million tons.

Extraction of minerals could attract private sector investments for the export market according to the African Development Bank.

"The mining sector, however, has restrictions

from a policy perspective and also suffers from institutional capacity constraints," notes the AfDB.

Currently there is only small scale mining, which involves sand, plaster sand, soapstone, cladding stones gravel and other building and construction materials.

With regard to large scale mining, coal, stone aggregates and ball clays are what is mined in Swaziland.

Acting Registrar and Chief Executive Officer Enziwe Dube, who is also the Managing Partner at LCC Capital Consulting, confirmed applications for registration are now open.

Dube said the first phase started on October 1, 2016 and will end on October 31.

"We are taking applications from individuals who are registered with any of the foreign Councils, especially those in South Africa," he said.

The Acting Registrar continued to say as of the November, 2016 up until the December 31, 2016 applications will be open for all individuals willing to be registered even first time applicants.

DUBE said the commencement of enforcement of compliance with the Act shall be March 1,2017.

"Post this date, no one – employed or practicing will be allowed to continue working or practicing as long as they are not registered, irrespective of whether an application has been lodged with Council," he said.

Dube said Section V to VIII of the Registration of Architects, Engineers, Surveyors and Allied Professionals Act No 15 of 2013, prohibits anyone from performing professional architectural work, engineering work, quantity surveying work and allied work if that person is not registered with the

Counci

He also highlighted the fact that the Act prohibits the employment of such persons to perform professional work whether in the public or private sectors, including parastatals.

"This served as a stern warning to employers to comply with the Act and only employ registered professionals failing which, this may result to a punishment of imprisonment for a period not exceeding five years and/or a fine not exceeding E 50 000 for first-time offenders, and in the case of a second or subsequence offenders, imprisonment for a period not exceeding ten years and/or a fine not exceeding E 100 000," he said.

Registration discounts for companies

THERE is good news as the Acting Registrar confirmed the Council Board looked into the submissions made by stakeholders in the workshop held last month at Esibayeni Lodge and decided to offer a bulk discount for group applications between 10 and 29, they will get a five percent discount and for 30 percent and above, they will get a 10 percent discount.

"Bulk discounts are applicable to companies, institutions and associations who shall apply to register their staff," he said.

The Acting Registrar mentioned it has come to the attention of the Council there are misconceptions going around that if you are not registered as a 'professional' in the different disciplines then you cannot practice in Swaziland, which is not the case as the Act only prohibits anyone from performing professional architectural work, engineering work, quantity surveying

work and allied work if that person is not registered with the Council. "You can operate but you will be

"You can operate but you will be prohibited from exercising the full rights of a professional such as signing of drawings as an architect. This is reserved exclusively for registered architects; the same applies for other disciplines," he said.

Misconception


Dube said the other floating misconception is one cannot register as a professional unless they have been registered as a "candidate" first, which again is not true as one can register directly as a professional if they meet the set registration criteria and guidelines of professionals in a relevant discipline.

"The Council has an interactive and informative website where all necessary information may be obtained including downloadable application forms at

www.aesap.net or call LCC Capital offices should one need further clarification", said Dube.

"We urge all individuals employed and or practicing as professionals in the country to apply for registration as soon as possible, preferably before the end of November as the applications have to go through a list of processes which may take up to three months or more, especially for first time registrants," he said.



Swaziland Economic Outlook 'weak' - World Bank

THE World Bank has painted a very bleak economic forecast for Swaziland in for the next couple of years.

The World Bank Macro
Poverty Outlook Report for
Swaziland released this month
said Swaziland's economic outlook is weak, as drought and
depressed regional prospects
continue to weigh on growth.
Gross Domestic Product (GDP)
is expected to decline by 0.9 percent in 2016, as sugar production, one of the major export
earners, is viewed to drop by 25
percent; maize by 64 percent,
and electricity generation by 23
percent

"The fiscal situation is expected to deteriorate further, as the impact of the 2016 salary review and falling Southern African Customs Union (SACU) revenues take stronger effect, with the budget deficit widening to od 15.3 percent of GDP in 2016," do the bank said.

With regards to SACU revenue the World Bank said, SACU revenues are projected to decrease to E5.3 billion, representing a significant 25 percent decline between 2015/16 and 2016/17.

"The current account surplus should continue to compress during the remainder of 2016, amid an increase in grain imports, and a decline in exports-especially of textiles," reads the report in part.

The bank said the falloff in exports is expected to be cushioned by the depreciating

exchange rate. Further, the manufacturing sector continues to suffer from the loss of the country's African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) trade benefits since January 2015.

The bank surmised as a result of these weak economic prospects, poverty and inequality are expected to remain critical challenges as growth of disposable income and job creation slows.

In its Drought Assessment Report the Word Bank concluded water sources declined by 50 percent which resulted in a reduction of 64 percent in crop production in the 2015/16 season and an increase in the number of vulnerable people by 68 percent in 2016.

"Further, the drought is expected to exert more inflationary pressure on food prices: the inflation outlook is expected to continue at an elevated level, averaging eight percent in 2016, and easing to below six percent only by 2018. This will affect the poor who spend a very high share of their total expenditures on food," the world bank said.

The intergovernmental organisation said Swaziland's inflation rate remained the highest among the Common Monetary Area members at 7.5 percent on average.

"Inflation pressures are driven by rising food prices as a result of the prevailing drought and depreciating exchange rate," the banks said.

Swaziland could be heading to another fiscal crisis - World Bank

THE World Bank Macro Poverty Outlook Report for Swaziland released this month said the fiscal situation poses significant risks in the short and medium terms.

"Fiscal risks emanating from the 2016 wage increase and declining SACU revenues might cause a crisis similar to the 2010/11 fiscal crisis," reads the report as part.

The Bank said this is compounded by the persistent drought as well as low growth in South Africa.

"The Swazi government initiated some measures to overcome these challenges by raising domestic revenues and stimulating growth through capital spending. However, such policy is unlikely to succeed because SACU revenues are expected to remain low in the foreseeable future and the expected impact of capital spending on growth may be less-than expected," the bank said.

The international bank said nominally, the fiscal deficit is in large measure domestically financed and may hamper private sector growth, while the accumulation of double- digit fiscal deficits will rapidly elevate public debt.

These sentiments have been echoed by the International Monetary Fund.

The International Monetary
Fund (IMF) in its World
Economic Outlook Report
October 2016 forecasted
Swaziland low economic growth
will continue until 2021 where
economic growth will be around
one percent.

"Swaziland economic growth next year will continue to be difficult as projections see the economy recording 0.9 percent economic growth," the IMF said.

The African Development
Bank (AfDB) African Economic
Outlook 2016 said prospects in
Swaziland for increased economic growth in 2017 'remains
poor.'

If the projection of the IMF, World Bank and African Development Bank hold true next year, Swaziland will be one of the slowest growing economies in Sub-Saharan Africa.

GAUTENG PREMIER SECURES MAJOR INVESTMENT DEAL

JOHANNESBURG - Gauteng Premier David Makhura has secured the first multibillionrand investment deal with one of the major provincial governments of Italy - giving hope to millions of unemployed people in the province.

This was also the first for Stefano Bonaccini - the governor of the Emilia-Romagna Region province in northern Italy, to sign such a groundbreaking deal with one of the regions of Africa, and Gauteng in particular.

The deal was concluded during the third South Africa - Italy Summit 2016, which began at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Rosebank yesterday.

The signing of the deal was witnessed by 250 chief executive officers from other African states and Italy, including diplomats and South Africa's government ministers.

Declaring his acceptance to invest in Gauteng, Bonaccini said he was not in the country to "build walls", but to extend his hand and work with Makhura to exchange ideas in the field of knowledge, research and agri-processing.

Entities like Johannesburg Water, Tshwane Water and others in the different municipalities were set to benefit. The Italian also vowed to assist in research through partnership with local universities and the setting up of manufacturing industries for the benefit of the two provinces.

"This is a five-year deal, but we are looking beyond the five years," he promised. Bonnacini said they chose Gauteng because the two provinces have a lot a common.

Both contribute significantly to

the GDP of their respective countries. His sentiments were also echoed by Italy's ambassador to South Africa Pietro Giovanni Donnici, who said his country chose South Africa because of its rule of law and the availability of institutions of democracy.

He said that created for the Italian government an environment to invest in South Africa and Gauteng. The ambassador was speaking after Water and Sanitation Minister Nomvula Mokonyane also signed a separate memorandum of understanding with her Italian counterpart, Barbara Degani, the deputy minister of environment, land and sea.

The occasion was also graced by the presence of the South African ambassador to Italy, Nomatemba Tambo - the daughter of former ANC president Oliver Tambo - who also gave the deal her bless-

However, it was her father who forged relations with the Italian government 40 years ago while still in exile. These Italians still hold Tambo in high regard, and his daughter said their deal would "show Europeans how to deal with Africa".

"It emerged during the summit that Makhura did a lobbying behind the scenes and managed to convince the European House Ambrosetti to choose Gauteng," she said.

The two previous South Africa-Italy summits were held in Cape Town and through Makhura's persuasion the Italian delegation headed to Gauteng. Makhura has vowed that all other similar summits would be held in Gauteng.

Pick n Pay puts job creation first

JOHANNESBURG - Pick n Pay Stores created more than 2 000 new jobs in the first half of its financial year and opened 74 new stores as part of plans to grow its market share in the face of South Africa's sluggish economic growth.

"The group is on track with its 2015 plan to create 5 000 new jobs per year by 2020. A further 2 100 new jobs were created in the first half of this year, bringing the benefits of work to more employees and their families," Richard Brasher, Pick n Pay's chief executive said on Tuesday. Pick n Pay, South Africa's second-largest food retailer, which signed a three-year wage agreement securing certainty after a deal with SA Commercial, Catering and Allied Workers Union, said it remained on track to spend close to R2 billion in capital expenditure this year on new store expansions and upgrading its current stores.

The announcement came as it posted its seventh consecutive growth in headline earnings yesterday, having cut costs following the implementation of its turnaround strategy.

Pick n Pay, which owns discount shopping chain Boxer, closed 0.89 percent higher on the JSE on Tuesday to trade at R66.63 a share as it reported that headline earnings had grown by 23 percent to 82.43 cents a share in the six months to August from 66.62c a share in the six months to August last year.

The group was unable to pass costs to consumers and capped food price inflation at 5.5 percent, below consumer price index food inflation of 10.7 percent over the period under review. *Business Report*

FNB hit by downtime, again

Sibanye clears state barrier to buy Amplats mines

CAPE TOWN – Sibanye [JSE:SGL] has cleared the final regulatory hurdle for its R4.58bn acquisition Anglo American Platinum's (Amplats) [JSE:AMS] Rustenburg mines, the companies announced in separate statements yesterday.

Sibanye was trading 2.92% higher at R41.99 yesterday at 09:30, increasing its market cap to R38.79bn, while Amplats was trading 0.32% higher at R343, with its market cap at R92.5bn. "We welcome the receipt of the Section 11 consent from the Department of Mineral Resources, which is the last

regulatory condition outstanding," Sibanye CEO Neal Froneman said in a statement,

"This transaction is consistent with Sibanye's strategy to grow its business in order to sustain its position as an industry leading dividend paying company," he said.

Acqusition

The acquisition, which is now officially unconditional, includes mining operations such as Bathopele, Siphumelele (including Khomanani), and Thembelani (including Khuseleka), as well as two concentrating plants, an on-site chrome recovery plant and the Western Limb

Tailings Retreatment Plant. Sibanye, a spin-off from Gold Fields, will assume ownership on November 1.

"The deal, along with the \$294m takeover of Aquarius Platinum last year, will put South Africa's second-largest gold producer by market value into the global top five producers of platinum group metals with annual output of more than a million ounces," Reuters reported yesterday. "For Anglo American Platinum, the transaction allows it to focus its strategy on newer, mechanised and less labour intensive mines."

PIC granted R300m in loans to VBS bank

PARLIAMENT – The VBS Mutual Bank received more than R300-million in loans from the Public Investment Corporation (PIC) since last year, according to details of the unlisted investments of its Isibaya fund, disclosed on Tuesday.

The bank, which granted President Jacob Zuma a loan to repay state funds spent on his Nkandla home, received four different loans to that total since July last year.

It currently owes about R300.427-million, according to the information given to Parliament's standing committee on finance by the PIC and Deputy Finance Minister Mcebisi Jonas at a briefing on Tuesday. The submission also reveals earlier loans of R6-million — extended in 2011 and 2013 — to the Venda Building Society, the name under which the bank traded in the past.

Investments are the bank's two biggest shareholders.
Established in 1982, the bank struggled financially for a considerable period but managed to post a profit of R4.9-mill-lion in the last financial year.

became widely known after granting Zuma a loan to repay R7.8-million by order of the Constitutional Court for luxuries added to his rural home during a costly and hugely controversial security upgrade.

The president transferred the sum to National Treasury in September. Explaining last month why Zuma turned to this particular financial institution, his spokesman Bongani Ngqulunga said VBS was "one of the few financial institutions which offer home loans in respect of land owned by traditional authorities". MPS REJECT HALF-BAKED REPORT ON R14.5BN LOSS

JOHANNESBURG - The details of PetroSA's massive R14.5 billion financial loss last year will not be known for now after the Department of Energy was refused by MPs to present a half-baked report.

Members of the portfolio committee on energy yesterday demanded a full forensic report of the financial loss by the state's oil firm.

Committee chairman Fikile Majola said they would not tolerate the conduct of the department to refuse handing over the full forensic report as ordered by Parliament.

Majola gave the department until

November 1 to come back with the report.

In the presentation, the department blamed the losses largely on non-performance of

PetroSA's Ikhwezi project in Mossgas.

"The Ikhwezi project's main failure
occurred as a result of low gas volumes
compared to what was predicted," it said.

"This can be attributed to a poor or lack of understanding of the reservoir risk in drilling the F-O field."

The F-O field is situated 110km from the nearest landfall and 40km south east of the F-A platform, which supplies gas and condensate to the PetroSA gas-to-liquid plant in Mossel Bay. "The project eroded value," the department said. Business Report

Obama tells Trump to 'stop whining'

WASHINGTON - President **Barack Obama on Tuesday** slapped down Donald Trump's claim the 2016 presidential race is rigged, telling the Republican to "stop whining" and get on with his campaign.

In language normally reserved for chastising a stroppy teenager, Obama discarded diplomatic decorum and skewered the mogul from the Rose Garden in front of visiting Italian Prime Minister Matteo

As Trump's poll numbers have been dragged down by accusations of sexual assault, he has unfurled a

litany of complaints about the nation's election system.

Democrat Hillary Clinton has widened her lead over Trump nationally and in key swing states three weeks before Election Day.

Bookmakers in Europe - where political betting is legal - have already begun to pay out on a Clinton win. "Of course there is large scale voter fraud happening on and before election day," Trump wrote on Twitter, without offering corroborating evidence.

Obama shot back: "There's no evidence that has happened in the past, or that there are instances in

which that will happen this time." "And so I'd advise Mr Trump to stop whining and go try to make his case to get votes," he told a news conference.

The withering riposte comes on the eve of the third and final presidential debate, and is just the type of comment that has baited Trump into launching distracting Twitter feuds and campaign speech tangents. Obama also renewed his effort to tether Republicans to Trump's faltering candidacy and described his behaviour as an aberration in American democratic history. AFP

Venezuela postpones state elections to 2017

CARACAS - Elections for Venezuela's state governorships will be held in 2017 rather than December as previously expected, the election board said on Tuesday, giving the unpopular socialist government a short breathing space before going to the polls.

Critics say authorities have delayed the state elections, and are also seeking to derail an opposition push for a referendum to recall President Nicolas Maduro, because they are scared of letting Venezuelans have their say.

Maduro, who replaced the popular Hugo Chavez in 2013 after his death, has seen his ratings halve to just over 20 percent amid a deep economic crisis in the OPEC nation.

The 23 state governors' four-year terms were to end in early January, with elections anticipated for December.

But National Election Board head Tibisay Lucena, who the opposition say is close to the government, announced they would instead be held towards mid-2017

Though Lucena did not give reasons, government officials have said exceptional measures are justified in Venezuela due to a US led "economic war" against them and the oil price crash which has slashed national revenues. With Chavez suffering from cancer but having just won re-election himself, the socialists swept to victory in 20 states at the last regional elections in late 2012.

But opinion polls show they would currently fare badly at any election, and government sources have said they are hoping for an oil price recovery to help their

Ministers battle over whether Britain should stay in European customs union amid warnings

LONDON - Ministers are at loggerheads over whether to quit the European customs union amid warnings it could mean a 4.5 percent hit to GDP.

Papers circulated at a meeting of the Brexit Cabinet committee apparently suggested leaving could clog up trade through Britain's ports.

The forecast for a GDP hit, is the average prediction for how much growth would be sacrificed by 2030 made in three studies carried out ahead of the historic referendum.

The research, by the Treasury, the thinktank Niesr, the Centre for Economic Performance and London

School of Economics focus on a Norway-style model where the UK exits the single market but stays inside the customs union. They have been heavily criticised by Leave supporters, who regarded them as part of

the failed 'Project Fear' attempt to scare voters off Brexit. International Trade Secretary Liam Fox is said to have backed withdrawal from the bloc at the meeting, arguing it would prevent global deals being done.

But Chancellor Philip Hammond highlighted the economic risks and Theresa May insisted she was not yet ready to make a decision on the UK's negotiating strategy, according to the Guardian.

The latest tensions emerged amid claims that Boris Johnson and David Davis have formed a pact to push for their version of 'hard' Brexit. AFP

ISIS holding civilians as human shields

Washington - Islamic State Jihadists were barring civilians from leaving Mosul on Tuesday and using them as human shields, as the battle for the Iraqi city entered its second day, a Pentagon official said.

"We know they are being used as human shields, absolutely," Pentagon spokesperson Navy Captain Jeff Davis told reporters. "They are being held there against their will. We have not seen any change in the last day of people leaving or fleeing." Authorities and aid agencies are bracing for a massive flow of civilians fleeing Mosul as the fight progresses. Currently, the action has largely been in villages surrounding Iraq's second-largest city and the remaining ISIS stronghold in the country. President Barack Obama warned of "significant" displacement but said the United Nations and other aid groups

were ready."We have put together plans and infrastructure for dealing with a potential humanitarian crisis that are as extensive as the military plans," Obama told reporters earlier. United Nations spokesperson Stephane Dujarric said an estimated 200 000 people are expected to be displaced in the first weeks of the offensive, growing to as many as one million under a worst-case scenario AFP

New Ebola vaccine to be tested next month in Canada

OTTAWA - An Ebola vaccine developed by Canadian researchers and considered by the WHO to be the first effective treatment against the virus will soon start a new phase of clinical trials, Ottawa

announced Tuesday. The vaccine's safety and effectiveness will be tested on volunteers infected with HTV, starting in Ottawa and Montreal in

November, and followed by trials in Senegal and Burkina Faso next year, the government said in a statement. The tests are being conducted in partnership with US pharmaceutical company Merck. "It is particularly important to study the effectiveness of this Ebola vaccine in vulnerable populations, such as those living with HIV," said principal investigator Cecile Tremblay. AFP

PRETORIA – There was no need for students to break down the doors of learning when these were already open, President Jacob Zuma said on Tuesday.

"There is no need for violent protests which give the impression that government is opposed to students," he told ambassadors and high commissioners at the Heads of Mission conference in Pretoria. The country's leaders supported and were sympathetic to the students' cause. He urged students to allow various groups time to find solutions. Government needed to ensure that universities completed the 2016 academic year while seeking medium- to long-term solutions.

Zuma urged those in attendance to come up with ideas of how South Africa could resolve the impasse over calls for free higher education.

Repeating comments made by ANC secretary general Gwede Mantashe in August, Zuma said the ANC-led government had gone beyond the goals for higher education the ANC set down in the Freedom Charter. In it, the ANC called for access to higher education through merit, while the government helped anyone in need.

He however warned those responsible for the violence and destruction of property on campuses. Students should not allow people to hijack their noble cause for the wrong reasons. He asked police to continue doing their jobs at institutions of higher learning. *News24*

TEARS AS COURT RULES IN SHEMBE CHURCH DISPUTE

DURBAN – It was a judgment that made grown men cry. After a five-year court battle, the KwaZulu-Natal High Court in Durban ruled on Tuesday that Vela Shembe is the rightful leader of the Nazareth Baptist Church.

Vela's supporters sang and beat drums as they accompanied him from the court to his car in Anton Lembede Street following KwaZulu-Natal Judge President Achmat Jappie's ruling. Traffic came to a standstill as his followers hooted and revved their engines.

A few elderly men sat on the side of the road and cried tears of joy. The battle for supremacy of the multi-million member church, commonly known as Shembe, had been in court since its leader Vimbeni Shembe's death in March 2011. His son, Mduduzi, and his cousin, Vela, both claimed to be his rightful heirs. News24

PRAVIN WILL GO TO COURT, WIN - FORMER CONCOURT JUDGE

CAPE TOWN – The case against Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan is a bad exercise in prosecutorial discretion, struggle stalwart and retired Constitutional Court judge Zak Yacoob said on Tuesday night.

"I have some concerns, because obviously the charge has been made for an improper reason," he told journalists after delivering the ninth annual Imam Haron Memorial Lecture in Lansdowne.

He said there was no real case for Gordhan to answer because he did something that had been done in the public service for a long time.

"Even if I am wrong in that, and there is a case for him to answer, there is no such a thing as prosecutorial discretion."

He completely backed Gordhan. "He got not a cent out of it and that is agreed by everyone. That is why it is bizarre to charge someone with fraud and theft when he got nothing out of it."

Gordhan told National

Director of Public Prosecutions Shaun Abrahams earlier on Tuesday that he would not be taking up his invitation to make representations by 17:00.

Instead he invited Abrahams to withdraw the charges against him in relation to an early retirement payout granted to former SARS deputy commissioner Ivan Pillay in 2010 and the extension of his contract.

Abrahams announced last week that Gordhan, Pillay and former commissioner Oupa Magashula would be charged with fraud. They are expected to appear in court on November 2. "I think obviously that Pravin will go to court, nothing much will happen. I think he will win his case and then we will see what happens," Yacoob said.

He joined a number of business leaders and Cabinet ministers such as Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa, Economic Development Minister Ebrahim Patel and Tourism Minister Derek Hanekom as well as ANC chief whip Jackson Mthembu in rallying behind Gordhan.

At the lecture on Tuesday night, an audience member asked what he thought about the future of the ANC.

He prefaced his answer by saying he had stopped being a politician many years ago "so don't take my word for it". TMG Digital

Court finds ATM bombing gang guilty of murder

PIETERMARITZBURG - Eight members of an ATM bombing syndicate were on Tuesday convicted of killing three people, including a police officer, during a crime spree several years ago.

Judge Yvonne Mbatha, in the KwaZulu-Natal High Court in Pietermaritzburg, found them guilty on charges of murder, attempted murder, and illegal possession of explosives and firearms, for six ATM demolitions in KwaZulu-Natal between September 2012 and January 2013. Mbatha said the bombings involved a vast amount of planning and preparation. They acquired prohibited explosives, weapons, detonators and other equipment, including crowbars, to smash the ATMs.

Eight of the nine men were arrested at Mtubatuba, apparently on their way to do another bombing in 2013.

They used three AK-47 machine guns and another weapon. The bombings were perpetrated after 00:00. In Utrecht, gang members who had been tasked with warding off policemen shot dead Bongakuhle Nkosi and Sizwe Gule, who were on their way to work. After a bombing at Midmar dam, near Howick, the gang shot dead police Constable Vidhur Jadu during a pursuit. They shot security guard Tafadzwa Michael Chappwanya in the stomach at Nottingham Road. Another man was shot in the leg as he was driving his family past the scene of a bombing in the middle of Howick.

Maimane demands copy of state capture report from new public protector

JOHANNESBURG Mmusi Maimane yesterday
said there is no "reasonable
justification" that new
Public Protector Busisiwe
Mkhwebane can deny his
demand to be furnished
with a copy of the report
into state capture.

"As the complainant in this matter, I am entitled by law to be provided with a copy of this report, which has been completed according to outgoing public protector, advocate Thuli Madonsela," the Democratic Alliance leader said.

"...Madonsela's statement that the state capture report is final and cannot be changed means that the current report must be handed over to the complainant," Maimane added. "It's just that simple."

"The report is complete, and there exists no reasonable justification to not furnish the complainant with the report – never mind make it public as constitutionally mandated to."

He noted that it "must be open to the public unless exceptional circumstances require that a report be kept confidential".

this report shows that the
president is petrified as to
what the report contains, and
desperate to stop it from
being made public."

Maimane said he had written to Mkhwebane to demand a copy of the report, which was placed in the care of the Speaker of Parliament, Baleka Mbete, after Madonsela last Friday decided not to release her report as initially planned.

Madonsela's delay in issuing it came after applications by Van Rooyen and Zuma threw a spanner in the works.

The report will remain in safekeeping until a ruling is made by the court in November.

It deals with allegations that the Gupta family had influenced the appointment of members of the cabinet.

It starts with footage of the powerful crocodiles attacking other animals and each other, before revealing the filmmakers getting up close and personal to six colossal reptiles.

Galante said: "The theory was by looking like a crocodile, acting like a crocodile, we might actually be a little bit safer and be able to get closer to the crocodiles.

"I don't know if those things played into it or not, but either way we got really close to the crocodiles and we were safe.

"When I was swimming with the crocodiles I was in this excited, tranquil, nervous, happy state all at once - I

mean it was just every kind of emotion you can imagine all at once while being in the water."

Both Forrest and Mark are hiding the exact location of their filming so other people do not try and replicate their astonishing crocodile discoveries.

And in some of the rare footage, one of the filmmakers appears under the water wearing nothing but swimming shorts as he aims the camera at the powerful beast just a few inches away.

Romanov said: "These creatures are just phenomenal, when you see them up close, the power they have, the grace they have, it's incredible to see.

"We're always looking to show stories about animals that people haven't seen before.

"This was a really interesting one to us because it showed animals, that are thought of as dangerous, in a capacity that we could interact with them."

It was nothing but their love for croc-

odiles that inspired the team to get so close to the sneaky predators.

"Both Mark and I are huge reptile nerds, we both grew up having tons and tons of reptiles and the crocodile is the ultimate reptile" Forrest added.

"So in our quest to make this nature film, and to explore this new perspective of crocodiles, we found this clear water area."

With up to six crocodiles swimming around them at one time, both Forrest and Mark had to remain on high alert.

Galante added: 'Mark and I



President signs bill on withdrawal

- The president of Burundi has signed legislation to make Burundi the first country to withdraw



from the International Criminal Court. The presidency said on Twitter Tuesday President Pierre Nkurunziza approved the law after it won lawmakers' support last week. Burundi's decision to quit the ICC follows a bitter dispute with the international community over the human rights situation in the East African country. More than a year of deadly violence has followed Nkurunziza's controversial decision to pursue a third term. AP

DR Congo clash leaves 20 dead

LUBUMBASHI - At least 20 people have been killed in three days of clashes in southeast DR Congo between Pygmy and Bantu people over a disputed caterpillar collection tax, a local parliamentarian told AFP on Tuesday. Local MP Kalunga Mawazo told AFP the fighting in Kabalo between Sunday and Tuesday was triggered by a dispute over the caterpillar harvest, a common food staple for the hunter-gatherer people of the Tanganyika region in northern Katanga." AFP

Shelves go bare as sugar prices soar

CAIRO – Borrowing a cup of sugar from your neighbour has rarely been so contentious in Egypt. At supermarkets across the country sugar has all but vanished, prompting media talk of a crisis and pushing the state to rapidly increase imports despite an acute dollar shortage and soaring global prices of the

sweetener.
Egypt consumes around three million tonnes of sugar annually but produces just over two million tonnes, with the gap filled by imports, usually between July and October when local beet and sugar cane supplies have wound down. *Reuters*

Zimbabwe graduation protest students hauled

HARARE - Three students who took part in a peaceful protest at their University of Zimbabwe graduation ceremony last month have been summoned to a disciplinary hearing for behaving in a way that might harm the university's interests, rights lawyers said on Tuesday.

Dressed in his academic robes, Tonderai Dombo held up a placard demanding jobs in front of graduating students - and President Robert Mugabe - on September 29. Two other students also protested, according to the Zimbabwe Lawyers for Human Rights.

They have been named as Thembinkosi Rushwaya and Alexander Mukamba. The three were arrested and released on payment of a 10 US admission of guilt fine.

But the university has revived the case, just as Higher Education Minister Jonathan Moyo insinuated the institution might when the protest occurred.

Claimed

ZLHR said the university claimed the protest breached a rule of student conduct known as Ordinance 30 which forbids behaviour "reasonably likely to be harmful to the interests of the univerity, members of the university staff or students."

Longtime leader Mugabe, 92, is Chancellor of the university, which controversially awarded his wife Grace a doctorate in 2014 after a reported three months of study.

Sparked by Harare pastor Evan Mawarire's impassioned outburst on social media in April, Zimbabwe's rolling street protests have slowed now.

Dombo and his colleagues' silent protest was one of the last acts of public defiance that occurred in a country battered by rising unemployment, corruption and economic malaise. Mugabe promised more than two million jobs ahead of elections in 2013, but the vast majority of Zimbabweans are employed in the informal sector, often in trading.

Tweeted one Zimbabwean on Tuesday in response to a question from a journalist as to what had happened to the protests: "People are weary of expressing their weariness maybe." News 24

Geneva prosecutor probes Equatorial Guinea president's son

GENEVA - Geneva prosecutor's office has begun a preliminary investigation into Teodorin Obiang, the son of Equatorial Guinea's president, the prosecutor's spokesman said on Tuesday.

The investigation was first reported in the Swiss 24heures newspaper, which said the Swiss authorities were responding to a request from their French counterparts.

Obiang, vice president of the small central African state, is to face trial in France for suspected money laundering, France's financial prosecutor said last month.

"A preliminary investigation is under way. That means we are right at the start of the inquiry. We are not making any other comment for the moment," the prosecutor's spokesman, Henri Della Casa, said by email.

Contacted by Reuters, Emmanuel Marsigny, Obiang's French lawyer, said he did not wish to comment.

Obiang has denied wrongdoing and has said his wealth, which has allowed him to buy luxury real estate in Paris, a private jet and a stable of exotic sports cars, was amassed legitimately through successful business dealings. *Reuters*

ICC TO DELIVER VERDICT ON DRC'S BEMBA

THE HAGUE - Judges yesterday delivered their verdict against former Congolese Vice-President Jean-Pierre Bemba and four close aides accused of bribing witnesses in a bid to derail his landmark war crimes trial.

Prosecutors have alleged from his prison cell the exrebel leader Bemba masterminded a network to bribe and manipulate at least 14 defence witnesses to lie during his trial at the International Criminal Court.

Bemba was sentenced in June to 18 years in jail on five charges of war crimes and crimes against humanity committed by his militia in Central African Republic.

Once the powerful leader of the Congolese Liberation

Movement (MLC) and a wealthy businessman from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Bemba, 53, remains behind bars in The Netherlands and is appealing the sentence.

But in a separate case after a tip-off to the prosecutor's

office, he was charged along with two of his lawyers, an MP from his party, and a defence witness of presenting fake documents to the trial and dealing out backhanders to secure false testimony.

It was the first such corruption trial in the ICC's history, and prosecutors said the allegations showed "how far the accused were prepared to go to hide their illegal behaviour".

Also in the dock are Bemba's lawyer Aime Kilolo, his legal case manager Jean-Jacques Mangenda, along with Congolese lawmaker Fidele Babala and Narcisse Arido, a defence witness.

All five have pleaded not guilty to more than 100 combined charges. AFP

DRC opposition rejects bid to postpone poll to 2018 KINSHASA - Democratic Republic of

Congo's main opposition party on Tuesday firmly rejected a move to postpone this year's presidential vote until April 2018 - handing President Joseph Kabila more than a year of extra time.

The UDPS led by veteran opposition leader Etienne Tshisekedi "rejects" the proposal mooted the previous day to delay the vote as a "flagrant violation" of the constitution, the party's Secretary-General Jean-Marc Kabund told AFP. The idea was announced on Monday by the authorities and fringe opposition groups taking part in a "national dialogue" held to reduce tensions triggered by fears Kabila has no intention of stepping down when his mandate ends in December.

Kabund said the postponement plan "unilaterally imposes Mr Kabila in flagrant violation of the constitution which sets the end of his mandate at December 20."

French Foreign Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault earlier on Tuesday said the plan was "no response to the crisis".

The offer emerged after the EU threatened sanctions if the country did not hold elections in 2017. AFP

UN PEACEKEEPING CHIEF PLEADS FOR SOUTH SUDAN ARMS EMBARGO

SOUTH SUDAN - UN
Peacekeeping Chief Herve
Ladsous is pleading with the
Security Council to impose
an arms embargo on South
Sudan where he expects an
upsurge in fighting with the
coming end of the rainy season.

Ladsous told reporters he had made his appeal directly to the council during a closed-door meeting on Monday.

"I think an arms embargo should happen now and that's

even very late," Ladsous told reporters on Tuesday.

"The rainy season is coming to a close and that has frequently been the time of the year when people go back to military operations."

The council is weighing its next steps in South Sudan after the government in Juba showed little cooperation with UN plans to deploy a 4 000-strong regional force. The council voted in August to deploy the force in Juba and

warned if the government opposed the plan it would face an arms embargo. Prospects for peace in South Sudan faded when rebel leader Reik Machar, who had been appointed vice president of a new unity government, fled Juba following heavy fighting in July. Machar has been replaced by Taban Deng Gai and is now in South Africa for medical treatment. He has called for renewed war with the SPLA forces of President Salva Kiir. AFP

MULTICHOICE Africa has stopped the production of its reality television shows, Big Brother Africa.

This was revealed by
MultiChoice Africa CEO Tim
Jacobs in an interview on
Saturday ahead of the CNN
MultiChoice 21st African
Journalists Awards held in
Johannesburg.

"It has been around for a long time. Not all countries got to follow it. It is a concept that has been there for over 10 years. It had some success, but did not generate the commercial success we had anticipated," Jacobs said. He said they found when they do Big Brother in this big format shows it works better when you do it in a particular country.

"We have just run Big Brother this year in Angola and South Africa runs its own.

It gets to resonate with that country or audience as compared

Its production was no longer making commercial sense and MultiChoice is now trying fresh programme formats

to when you do it with multiple competitors.

There is interest, but it is too dispersed and ends up not making the commercial sense intended," he said. Jacobs said they are at the same time trying new and fresher other big format shows that have become in their opinion relevant, as people demand

fresh stuff.

"So instead of doing Big Brother we are trying to move with the times and try shows like Voice, which we produce across many parts of the continent, like South Africa, Angola and Nigeria.

So far the response has been good and we are happy as music

and rhythm is endemic in the African culture."

He however stated it doesn't mean they will no longer consider doing Big Brother Africa again, but it means they are also trying new formats, news shows, fresher stuff and seeing how each of them resonates with their audiences.

DIGITAL MIGRATION

TIM Jacobs says his company is assisting some African countries where they operate to manage the transition from analogue to digital signals.

He said as a company they have been operating on digital platform known as DSTV for many years.

"That is not the digital migration that governments are dealing with. We are talking of the transition from analogue to Digital Terrestrial Transmission (DTT). We have a brand called GOTV, which we operate in nine African countries.

In those countries where we have set-up our own networks and we certainly try to assist governments in their digital transition," he said.

Jacobs said they do not assist
Botswana for example as it operates a standard different from the
rest of the countries in the continent.

He said in countries like

Zambia, Kenya (which has switched off completely its analogue transmission and Namibia), they do assist those governments.

"There are two parts into the digital migration, which is setting up the infrastructure that allows the signals to be distributed and the second part is giving every household access to that signal (set-top box).

"We have tried in the countries where we operate DTT networks that make commercial sense to subsidise set-top boxes and make it possible for people to access these gadgets and convert from analogue to digital signal.

"However, different countries have different needs, so we sometimes offer advice on how to go about this transition phase or offer technical training and there are times where we educate them on how we have set up DTT in some countries where we operate. We play a role," Jacobs said.

CNN, MultiChoice African Journalists Awards cannot fix journalism standards

MULTICHOICE Africa CEO Tim Jacobs says the continent journalism standards and quality cannot be fixed by an awards programme like the CNN MultiChoice African Journalists Awards.

"The function is to highlight and showcase story telling and what goes on behind the scenes. That is how much risk journalists take in investigating and exposing corruption in certain countries. And how much integrity plays in coming up with that story when we know that journalist's life is in danger and people don't want to share that information," he said in an interview with the Swazi Observer over the weekend.

"That is what the awards can achieve and highlight. This programme allows us the opportunity to know what is happening within the continent," Jacobs said.

He said it is also important that when journalists do their work they are first and foremost not driven by the desire to win an award, but more about their conviction to tell the story or get to its bottom.

"To get an award is an after effect, but it motivates you in your peer group," he said.

When asked if MultiChoice Africa with its partners would consider doing regional or country awards before the continental event, Jacobs said logistically it may be a challenge.

"We would need to ensure quality and avoid bias to ensure the standards of integrity are maintained. I am not saying it does not have conceptual merit but practically it may have some complications," he said.

Quality

When asked how they ensure the quality of journalism improves, Jacobs said their primary focus is to provide television programming, but stay away from news production.

"We carry channels with news on it, but do not produce news or direct the outcome of news.

One of the reasons is we try to stay away from the political arena. We are a regulated industry, we showcase and carry channels that are in the business of news, but we don't participate in that space.

A lot of that is done through editorial policies that we don't influence but just carry their platforms," he said.

Jacobs said even a small thing like a financial contribution from them may find that in a way it starts to influence certain things, hence they stay out of such issues.

"We are a TV platform provider and not a news producer," he said.

When asked if we can count on MultiChoice for continued support of these awards?

"Like all good business executives, we never commit for the long haul, but we have nothing on the table to say we will not continue to support it, but at the same time I cannot say it will be here forever.

"We believe it plays a unique role in the continent and we use this event to bring our guest and stakeholders on board. So long as it has meaning in the continent I don't see us stopping to support the programme."



ing up a single point in their last two Bundesliga matches with an inexperienced lineup. "There will be setbacks, no doubt, given the age of the team and the three competitions we are playing in." Dortmund CEO Hans-Joachim Watzke told Reuters recently. "That is something that cannot be avoided." However, there was no evidence of stage fright among Dortmund's talented youngsters on Tuesday as they took a 2-0

MOST CHAMPIONS LEAGUE WINS

Madrid-Iker Casillas helped porto to a 2-1 win away at Brugge and in doing so set the record for the most wins in the Champions

The goalkeeper has won 92 games in Europe's top competition spanning his career for Real Madrid and

Casillas made an immediate impact in his debut Champions
League season for Real when he became the youngest player to play in goal at 19 years and four days old and helped them win the competition when they beat Valencia in Paris in the 1999/2000 season.

It was the first of three Champions
League titles he won with Real over his 16 year career at the Bernabeu.

Porto's win in Belgium took
Casillas to 92 wins in the competition — one ahead of former
Barcelona star Xavi — and if the
Portuguese side are to get out of the
group then they will need to win a
few more games as they currently
sit third behind Leicester and
Copenhagen.

At 35 Casillas is sure to have a few more seasons left to play and will have the opportunity to extend his record.

But with Xavi retired, the biggest threat to his record comes from his former Real Madrid teammate Cristiano Ronaldo who is 11 wins behind on 81.

And with the holders going well in Europe there is every chance the

Portugal super star will be able to narrow the gap this season. Another of Casillas' former team

-mates, Raul is next on the list with 79 wins in the Champions League and then comes two-time winner and Manchester United hero Ryan Giggs who has 74 wins to his name.

Barcelona star Andres Iniesta has won 71 times while his former captain at the Nou Camp is next with 67 wins in Europe's premier club competition.

One-time winner and two-time runner-up Philipp Lahm is next on the list with 66 wins — one ahead of Dutch legend Clarence Seedorf.

The next goalkeeper on the list is ex-Barcelona stopper Victor Valdes

LONDON - Arsenal Manager Arsene Wenger believes a serious challenge for trophies will go a long way towards convincing influential winger Alexis Sanchez and midfielder Mesut Ozil to sign new long-term deals at the club.

Ozil and Sanchez have entered the last 20 months of their current contracts at the Emirates Stadium and will hope to secure hefty pay rises to their reported 140 000 pounds (\$171 654.00) per week salaries to stay beyond 2018

Wenger admitted while the financial aspects of contract negations were important, it was Arsenal's on-field progress that would prove decisive.

"I think these kind of players can raise a little bit above the financial aspect of the game because they are not poor and they have to look really at the football side," the 66-year-old told British media.

"It is more about whether the club can meet their needs on the football front. If 'yes' then a Premier League club can find an agreement with the players. We still keep values we have at the club, of course, and we pay what we can afford."

Chile international Sanchez has scored five goals in 10 appearances in all competitions this season, while Germany's Ozil has

chipped in with several decisive goals, including the winner against Swansea City last weekend. Arsenal have won two FA Cups since the 28-year-old Ozil arrived from Real Madrid in 2013, while the 27-year-old Sanchez has one FA Cup winner's medal to his name after moving to North London from Barcelona a year later.

"We still have a scale of wages... But don't worry, they are all paid well. It's normal players try to get the maximum out of the negotiations. They have to feel you meet their needs at the club and they get paid for it," Wenger added.

Arsenal, currently top of their Champions League group, hosted Bulgarian club Ludogorets Razgrad yesterday.

ROONEY PICKS PLAY-FIGHTS WITH 2 MAN UNITED'S BACKROOM STAFF

MANCHESTER - Dressing-room banter is usually limited to players but Masseur Rod Thornley showed even Premier League medical staff aren't immune when he found himself at the centre of a play-fight involving two Manchester United stars.

Twenty-four hours after Juan Mata and Ashley Young mocked Eric Bailly's white sandals stringing the centre back's footwear up on a coat hanger and posting pictures on social media, the wave of childlike enthusiasm continued to sweep the club's Carrington training ground yesterday, with Thornley the latest victim. The brother of former United trainee Ben was minding his own business during a session ahead of the visit of

Fenerbahce today when he was accosted by England captain Wayne Rooney.

The striker grabbed him in a headlock before pulling him to the turf, at which point Young mimicked delivering a final blow to the ribs.

There was no malice involved in the incident, which came within a particularly cheerful training session for the Red Devils, and Thornley, Rooney and Young all laughed it off afterwards. The Masseur has been a part of the United backroom staff since the turn of the century, combining his work at club level with a role as soft tissue therapist for the Football Association. His time with the national setup ended in 2014, however, when then-Red Devils

boss Louis van Gaal insisted the former non-League striker committed himself entirely to his work at Old Trafford.

Last year, Rooney paid for Thornley, along with current England support staff Steve Kemp and Carlo Sertori, to visit Las Vegas for an end-of-season blow-out. The Three Lions skipper - who earns £300 000 per week at United spent £15 000 flying the medical professionals out to Sin City. Rooney wasn't about to make do with one take-down, though, and Ricardo Formosinho was next in his sights.

"If you are talking about this summer, I never called Messi. I never called Neymar, Luis Suarez, (Sergio) Busquets, (Andres) Iniesta, I didn't call anybody," insisted Guardiola.

"As for Ter Stegen I knew he wanted to play all the time. We got in touch.

He wasn't happy with his situation. We needed a goalkeeper like Claudio or Ter Stegen. 'Claudio came and Ter Stegen decided to stay.

If I ever called a player playing in any other club it would have been a special situation of not playing, and it would be my right to but I never called Leo Messi."

Mexican tennis player banned for match-fixing

LONDON - Mexican tennis player Daniel Garza has been suspended for six months and fined \$5 000 (R69404.50) after being found guilty of match-fixing, the Tennis Integrity Unit said on Tuesday.

The 31-year-old, ranked 1 065th in singles, had attempted to influence the outcome of a match at an ITF Futures tournament at Calabasas, California, in March 2015, the sport's corruption watchdog

The case, based on a TIU investigation, was heard in Miami last month.

Garza, who achieved a career-high ranking of 294 in 2012, was banned with immediate effect, the TIU said in a state-

World tennis was rocked in January by allegations that the game's authorities had failed to deal with widespread match-fixing in the sport.

The authorities rejected media reports that 16 players who have been ranked in the top 50 had been repeatedly flagged to the TIU over suspicions they had thrown matches in the past decade. A number of comption-related cases have since come to light. Reuters







He let loose a volley outside the box in the 40th minute but Green Mamba keeper Japter Merese parried the ball away for a fruitless corner.

The goalless halftime scoreline

was not a true reflection of the match. Second-half play started in frenetic fashion with Green Mamba coming close to scoring in the 48th minute but his shot went wide. Mamba again staged a 58th minute break-out from deep inside their half.

From this point onwards, The Correctional Services side stepped up their game appreciably with a flurry of attacks into the opposition goalmouth but their lone reward was a corner which Wanderers keeper Mbongeni gathered safely.

Wanderers soaked the pressure but also made some attacks until the referee blew the final whistle. Meanwhile Mbabane Highlanders lost 1 - 2 against Manzini Sundowns.
