

PARLIAMENT RESPONSIBLE FOR FAILURE TO REGAIN AGOA

THE Swaziland Parliament is accused of being directly responsible for the country's failure to regain its AGOA status, in the process subjecting thousands of Swazis to high levels of unemployment and grinding poverty.

Labour and Social Security Minister Winnie Magagula told Senate yesterday a window of opportunity open to the country to be reconsidered at the International Labour Organisation (ILO) might be closed before parliament passed four contentious Bills into law before end of next month.

Minister Magagula was at pains trying to explain the importance of having the Bills amended as recommended by ILO and passed before the country could miss the August deadline for submission.

She said in September this year, ILO would meet to review the country's status and success to regain its AGOA status would be dependent on parliament's ability to pass the Bills on time

(AGOA) markets. The minister made a passionate request to the legislators to take into serious consideration the plight of the Swazis and play their role in full as legislators and also as a body tasked with an oversight role. She pleaded with Senate to help her speed up the legislative process to ensure the four contentious Bills were amended and enacted into law, time-mously. These AGOA markets are provided by the government of the United States of America. The minister said for the past eight months the Bills have been lying unattended in parliament despite them having been submitted with a certificate of urgency.

These are the Public Order Bill, the Suppression of Terrorism Bill, Correctional Services Bill and the Workman's Compensation Bill. Minister Magagula said she submitted these Bills in parliament in November last year, but to date, not a single one has been passed into law. The minister said the executive arm of government had started wondering if the legislators saw the need and understood the urgency with which these Bills were submitted. The minister advised that presiding officers should jointly attend to the matter and urgently come up with an amicable solution that would benefit the nation.

Where is Minister Gideon? - Senator wonders

PRINCIPAL Secretary in the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade Jinnoh Nkambule was questioned about the whereabouts of his Minister Gideon Dlamini.

This follows the minister's rare appearance in official assignments listed in the government calendar for almost the whole of this month.

However, he re-emerged a week ago during the prime minister's departure to Kigali, Rwanda for the African Union summit.

He also attended the KickStart awards which were held a day after the prime minister's departure.

During the function, he was the one who introduced the deputy prime minister, who represented the prime minister on the day. After then, most of his assignments were again handled by the PS.

Yesterday, after forwarding the minister's 'sincere' apologies for not attending the official opening of the workshop for senctors on the Fair Trading and Consumer Protection Bill and Regulations, Chairperson of the ministry of commerce portfolio committee Senator Lindiwe Ngwenya asked Nkambule about the whereabouts of the minister.

"We are concerned about the minister's disappearance of late, where is he?"

"This is the fourth time we are meeting and he is not here," she added. Earlier in his introductory remarks, the PS said something came up and the minister was held up.

"He is at the ministry's boardroom as we speak, busy with other ministerial duties."

Asked if he knew any reasons that could withhold the minister from honouring public assignments, Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane said he was not aware of anything.

"We are also not privy to how and when ministers can choose to delegate."

When the minister was contacted yesterday, he said there were too many things happening at the same time.

"We are preparing for a lot of other national events, while cabinet also has a lot of committees and everything needs to be sorted accordingly. We are also busy with the preparations for the upcoming SADC Summit, that is why most of the time I delegate the PS, but where I can, I try to be available. I think this shall soon pass, after August, I will be available," he said.

He apologised to the chairperson of the portfolio committee and the whole committee.

... Moi Moi shifts blame to House of Assembly

SENATOR Vuka Moi Moi Masilela put the blame squarely on the shoulders of members of the House of Assembly, accusing them of focusing on leadership squabbles at the expense of national duty.

Senator Masilela said he was highly disturbed and disappointed that senators were also being fingered as having contributed to the country's failure to meet international obligations yet the Bills were not stuck with the upper chamber. He said the senate president was there to concur with him that in the president's office there was not a single Bill awaiting their attention.

He said first the accusation was levelled against them by Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini. He said the PM alleged more than 40 Bills were lying idle in parliament. Masilela appealed to anyone in authority or anyone with a credible forum to exonerate the Senate and explain to the public that

there were two chambers in parliament. He shifted the blame to the lower chamber, the House of Assembly, arguing that members there were preoccupied with leadership squabbles amongst themselves. "There are people here who were elected only to enjoy salaries, imitate and appear as though they were chiefs in their respective communities," said Masilela.

He said that was contrary to what they stood for as senators.

"We want to work for the nation. Let's face the truth, why are we not passing the Bills because that is our core function and that is what we are paid for; to legislate!," argued Masilela.

He decried that at the lower chamber, the prominent issue was the leadership disputes they were embroiled in. Describing the situation in the House of Assembly in vernacular, Masilela said: 'Kusuke lutfuli lweTingongoni' and senators were just victims inhaling the dust; meaning bulls were fighting and, as expected, the grass was suffering. Concluding his argument, he emphasised: 'there are no Bills stuck in Senate!'

Man poisons 20 goats with weevil tablets, 5 dead

A man of Pigg's Peak poisoned 20 goats belonging to his neighbours with weevil tablets. Five have since died.

The incident, which has left residents of Luhlangotsini, an area outside Pigg's Peak in shock, happened on Tuesday.

The owner of the goats who preferred anonymity alleged that his neighbour crushed weevil tablet and mixed them with porridge to kill his goats.

"He claims it was all a mistake because he wanted to kill his dogs with the weevil tablets as they were attacking and killing

our goats in the area in the past weeks," said the goats' owner.

The inner council ordered the dog owner to put down his dogs if he failed to

control them from killing residents' goats.

The goats' owner said the matter was then reported to the community elders who summoned the owner of the dogs who were found feeding on the dead goats.

He said on Tuesday two of his goats were found dead and the following day three more died.

"All the four goats are mine while the other one belongs to a neighbour," he said.

He said for now five goats were dead while the other 15 were undergoing treatment by a vet officer.

"The dead goats were found with foam coming from their mouths." He said a veterinary officer was called to conduct a post-mortem which showed the goats had eaten a poisonous substance.

"The culprit said he only intended to kill his dogs that were killing his neighbours' animals in the area."

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendant Khulani Mamba confirmed that the matter was reported to the Pigg's Peak Police Station.

"Officers are still investigating the matter," he said.

Landela bumper pay warning from cops

The Royal Swaziland Police has warned civil servants who got their bumper pay to be extra careful as thieves will be out to get their hard earned money.

This follows after banks also urged the police to strengthen security, especially in ATMs this long weekend, in fear of the landela gang, which is known for robbing members of the public after withdrawing money from banks.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba said members of the public should be on the lookout for fraud scams.

"That could be SMSes about winning lucrative amounts of money to emails from people you know claiming to be stuck somewhere and in need of cash to return home," he said. Mamba further urged people who will be enjoying the money to stay away from the road while under the influence of alcohol, "We do not care how people will be spending their money but they should not drive while under the influence of alcohol because if so, the police will get them and the law will take its course," he said.

He added that the Royal Swaziland Police would be on the roads and other places to ensure the safety of all

IT'S a déjà vu literally.

The controversial data bundles new charges that caused uproar among cellphone users will be back with effect from August 1.

Just that this time it is dressed in another dress. The other change is that the public has been given a week to adjust to the notorious bundles story.

"Swazi MTN is rolling out a new breed of data bundles known as "MTN WoW Bundles" through which the company is giving customers 50% more volume so they may have access to the internet, and other online Applications," said MTN's Mandla Luphondvo.

He said this was in line with the company's data strategy which seeks to make data bundles more affordable, and appealing, resulting in an improved customer experience.

"The introduction of 'MTN WoW Bundles' will not replace the existing generation of bundles, which have since been named 'MTN Standard Bundles.'

The only difference is that whilst in the past, it was possible to go around validity times by purchasing a lower level bundle of E2, for instance, this will now not be possible. This was possible because of a systemic challenge, which has since been resolved alongside modernisation of the network," he said.

Hitting exactly the raw nerve they hit the last time before the new charges were withdrawn, Luphondvo said all bundles whether old, or new would expire on the stipulated time.

"For instance, for MTN WoW Bundles, the daily version, will expire at mid-night the following day. Thus if a customer buys a bundle on 1st of August at 11:00pm, that bundle will expire on the 2nd of August at 12mid-night," said.

He further stated that for the weekly version, expiry would take place seven days after the day of purchase.

"Additionally, all unused data at the time of the stipulated date will expire. As already indicated, customers will not be able to extend validity automatically by purchasing another bundle which means all bundle volumes will be valid for what is stated," he emphasised.

Luphondvo said customers could share data, check their balance, and purchase the bundles through the short code *686# and follow the prompts as the long dial string will no longer work. And the short code 567 will not exist anymore.

Ministers fear vote of no confidence - Moi Moi

CABINET ministers allegedly fail to face members of the House of Assembly to demand answers for failure to fulfil their legislative role because they fear the dreaded vote-of-no-confidence the MPs brandish on their faces.

Senator Vuka Moi Moi Masilela alleged cabinet ministers were afraid to tackle the inefficiencies and neglect of national duty by the MPs that was evidently clear.

The fear of being forced into back-benchers through the use of a vote of no confidence as a powerful instrument, Masilela said, was the only reason the cabinet ministers chickened when tackling matters involving the members of the lower chamber.

Also of concern to Masilela, was the growing tendency by government to send incompetent legislators and officials to represent the country at the international forums.

Addressing in particular the government's failure to meet ILO benchmarks, he advised the minister that the attorney general should always make the list of the Geneva-bound delegation in Switzerland to ensure the concerns raised by the international body were clearly understood.

He said this would help avoid a situation whereby the country found itself having to work on one and the same pieces of legislations and still be accused of having failed to attend to them correctly and up to the required standard.

The minister's response was that government always made sure the delegation comprised of competent representatives of all

the tripartite bodies.

Senator Lindiwe Ngwenya concurred with Masilela that the capacity of those attending the international conferences should be carefully considered. She said it was also imperative government improved on her negotiations skills, though there shall be no consensus at all times.

Senator Prince Kusa said it should be everyone's responsibility to ensure the country was removed from the ILO Special Paragraph, adding they could do so by exercising their oversight role as legislators.

He implored cabinet ministers and the presiding officers to prioritise issues, especially the tabling of the Bills that needed their attention. The chief of Mdumezulu in the Lubombo region said it did not go down well with them when the country was placed in the Special Paragraph.

Minister Magagula emphasised that indeed such status negatively affected the country socially and economically.

"She said for a country to be in the Special Paragraph was tantamount to being subjected to soft sanctions.

These arguments were triggered by a motion by Senator Masilela calling upon the senators to debate the minister's ILO Report.

GNT DUCKS JNT MEETING

GOVERNMENT Negotiations Team (GNT) ducked the Joint Negotiation Team (JNT) meeting which was slated for yesterday indefinitely.

The JNT had jointly scheduled a meeting for yesterday to discuss and iron-out pending issues that were left out during the last JNT meeting where both parties signed an agreement for the implementation of the salary review.

Swaziland National Association of Teachers General Secretary Muzi Mhlanga said the Public Sector Associations (PSAs) only received the letter informing them about the postponement late yesterday.

"The only reason that was stated for the postponement of the JNT was that the principal secretary who is heading the negotiations had other commitments today (yesterday)".

Mhlanga said the meeting was meant to be a continuation of salary negotiations.

He stated that when they signed the agreement, they agreed upon meeting after the implementation of the salaries and discuss pending issues such as that of allowances as it was not accommodated in the salary review agreement they signed.

"The meeting was also to address the issues of civil servants who were given pay grades that suggest a demotion, placing and paying their subordinates above them. For



instance, according to the salary review report a head of department in a college is now at the same notch as the principal of the same college," he said

Mhlanga went on to express his disappointment with government, saying the PSAs struggled with having government finally agree on implementation of the salary review, yet politicians had it easy.

"When we wanted government to implement the salary review they kept telling us that government had no money and that the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said if government implemented the salary review the country would be in a bad economic state. It is surprising and shocking at the same time to learn that the politicians have awarded themselves handsomely with a 32% salary increase. What will IMF say to that? This goes to show everyone what kind of politicians we have in this country. Their 32% salary increase is a sizeable amount since their salaries are high already," said Mhlanga.



MUNICIPAL Council of Mbabane CEO Gideon Mhlongo should be fired because he abuses Mbabane residents.

This is what was expressed by Ward One residents, when they marched to the offices of the municipal council yesterday.

The residents, through their organisation, known as Lalufadlane Association, are against the fact that the council wants them to buy the land which they occupy under Ward One. Some of the stands in the area are said to cost about E17 000.

The ward includes areas such as Mahwalala (Zone 5 and 6), Nkwalini (Zone 2, 3 and 4), Hilltop, Manzana (Zone 1) and Lomkiri Township. Lalufadlane Association was formed to safeguard the interests of the people living in Ward One.

Residents

The residents claim that they occupied the land under Ward One way before it was under urban development. Some of them even claimed that they occupied the land through the kukhonta system. They said they khontaed to Chief Zembe, whose area of jurisdiction also include Ward One.

What also confuses the residents is which institution they have to pay allegiance to as they feel that there is now a clash between the traditional and urban institutions.

The march which started at 10am at Hilltop, saw the residents walk all the to the ministry of housing and urban development, which is situated in the

building that was once occupied by the income tax department. While walking there they were chanting political and religious songs, which expressed the pain they felt under Mhlongo and Mbabane Mayor Benito Jones.

They delivered a petition at the ministry, which was received by Director of Housing and Human Settlement Bhekithemba Matsebula. The march then proceeded to the offices of the council, via the gates of Mbabane Government Hospital and Makhosikhosi Road.

At the council, the petition was received by Deputy Mayor Sithembiso Hlanze.

Chairperson of Lalufadlane Association Paulos Shongwe said they were saddened by the manner in which the council was treating them.

"We have been occupying this area way before the council was there. We have developed this area as we removed every rock and tree that we found here.

Right now, we are at risk of losing the land we had wanted to pass on to our children because of the council," Shongwe said, before they commenced the march.

He went on to state that they were not consulted by the council before it implemented the exercise. What was

even more painful, according to Shongwe, was that most of the residents in that ward were not in gainful employment. He wondered how it was possible for the people to buy the stands.

Suggested

He suggested that the right thing was to remove Mhlongo from the office because he was ruling the city with an iron fist.

He said Mayor Jones should also be removed because he was colluding with Mhlongo to make sure the Mbabane residents suffered.

The chairperson's sentiments were echoed by Lalufadlane Association

Secretary Nomvula Msibi, who stated that what the council imposed on them was negatively affecting them, as they were made to buy their own land.

The council did so without taking their economic status into consideration.

"What is even more problematic is that for those who paid for the stands, before computers were introduced to the council, might find themselves paying for the second time if they have no receipts to show that they paid for the stands.

I am lucky because I managed to keep my receipts. If I did not do that, I would find myself paying E17 000 for the second time," Msibi said.

SWAZI TV ORDERED TO RE-INSTATE ALL ADVERTS **FOR SA AGENCY**

HIGH Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze has directed Swazi TV to comply with a E1.2 million advertising deal that was sealed by suspended CEO Austin Dlamini with a South African advertising agency.

The South African agency, KPM Media, had taken the Swaziland Television Authority to court eiting breach of agreement which allowed it to flight TV adverts for shops such as Shoprite, Hifi Corporation, Lewis Stores and Kentucky Fried Chicken (KFC).

It also advertised for Unilever, among others.

The court action came after the national television station cancelled all adverts brought in by KMP Media, subsequent to an agreement it signed with Dlamini in July last year, Dlamini was reported to have represented the

station in signing the E1.2 million contract agreement wherein KMP Media would buy advertising slots from the station and then sell it to a number of multi national supermarkets and shops.

KPM Media had been represented by its Managing Director Pushpinder Singh, but Swazi TV cancelled the airing of adverts for the former's clients.

It had instructed lawyer Kenneth Simelane from Henwood and Company and Swazi TV opposed it through its law firm Robinson Bertram on the grounds that the contract had been signed by the suspended CEO without authority from the board. It told the SA

Johannesburg based company that there was no existing agreement between them.

But Justice Fakudze issued a judgment in favour of KMP Media which means the station will, with immediate effect, make available advertising space for the company.

KPM Media, according to Singh, dealt with purchasing advertising slots in many broadcasters across the continent in countries such as Swaziland, Nigeria, Ghana, Namibia and the Republic of Congo. He said such slots were then utilised by its clients in each of these countries.

"These businesses then rely on KPM Media to ensure that their advertisements are aired on Swazi TV as the ideal means of

communicating with the Swazi consumers, KPM Media is contractually obliged to ensure that the clients' advertisements are aired on the designated dates and times," Singh said in his affidavit

accompanying the application. Meanwhile, Swazi TV had argued that the contract was not valid because the board had not sanctioned its birth. It argued that compliance to the contract could not be enforced because it was concluded in violation of the station's statutory provisions.

It further argued that the contract was financially prejudicial to it and an order directing the station to honour it would be against public policy.

It was further argued on behalf of the station that a court cannot impose an order that would bring hardship to another party.

Civil servant wants PS Dr Zwane jailed

A civil servant wants the Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Health Dr Simon Zwane to be jailed for 30 days for contempt of court.

Sithembile Shongwe has instructed lawyer Mandla Mdluli of MH Mdluli Attorneys to institute legal proceedings against Zwane seeking an order declaring that he is held in contempt of court. She claimed the principal secretary failed to comply with a court order he had agreed to in October 2015.

She claimed that she and Zwane, who was representing the ministry of health, had entered into an agreement which stipulated that she was to be re-instated to her original grade of CH5 notch 6.

The re-instatement, she alleged was to be effected from March 2015, when the

Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC) issued a consent award. Shongwe had challenged the ministry's decision to change her salary grade to a lower grade without consultation and she was further demoted from a managerial position.

Claimed She claimed that after the CMAC award, the parties entered into an agreement and it was further agreed that it should be made an order of the

Industrial Court.

as per her grade CH5 notch 6."

She submitted that Zwane was fully aware of the court order by virtue of it being served to the attorney general's offices, which represented him in court.

However, she alleged that Zwane has ignored, neglected, failed or refused to comply with the court order without lawful justification.

She submitted that the PS' failure to obey court orders was not only a sign of disrespecting the court's authority, but it showed he was looking down upon the dignity of the rule of law in the country. She further submitted that such had very serious implications in the business community in that no investor could invest in a country where orders were just illusions.

She further applied for an order mulcting the PS with costs on punitive scale. The matter is pending before court.

Maliyaduma man charged for gruesome murder of girlfriend

THE man who gruesomely stabbed his lover to death in front of community members at Maliyaduma has been formally charged with murder.

Thulani Matower Tsabedze of Maliyaduma is accused of killing his lover Sonto Mdluli on November 8, 2015 in the same area. The incident reportedly took place in broad daylight.

Director of Public Prosecutions Nkosinathi Maseko has formally charged Tsabedze with murder and issued a charge sheet before the High Court in readiness for trial.


It has been alleged that the bone of contention was not established as the two were seen walking together in the community, but he suddenly flashed out a knife and stabbed Mdluli several times all over the body.

She collapsed immediately and residents then raised alarm.

It has been claimed that Tsabedze then fled the scene with the knife still in hand. The deceased was also from the same community. After the incident, her family members were called and found her lying in a pool of blood where she had been stabbed.

The accused later handed himself over to the Manzini Police Station. It is alleged that he asked his friend Zibuse Ndzinisa to accompany him to the police. According to the summary of evidence, seven witnesses have been lined up to testify and proof the guilt of the accused.

Their identities will not be revealed for their safety. The accused has not yet entered a plea to the charge.



VIOLENT MQOLO PUPILS CARRY KNIVES TO SCHOOL

IN a rather startling revelation, Mqolo Central Primary Principal Archie Thwala has said pupils in the school were out of control and had turned vio-

He said these pupils were bringing dangerous weapons to the school including knives and sharp dangerous objects.

The principal revealed this during a parents' meeting held at the school on Tuesday morning, "A few weeks ago, a grade three pupil was caught carrying a

" I have confiscated a number of dangerous objects from pupils in the school that could cause harm to others. My office has now been turned into a mini courtroom because, day in and day out, pupils are brought to my office and I have to try



and solve their problems resulting from the unending squabbles," he said.

The meeting that was prompted by the preparation of a farewell function for two teachers that will be held at the school, towards the end of the third term.

Theft

Thwala said the pupils then were so rude, unruly and had turned to petty theft. He said those in grade six and seven were the main culprits. "This behaviour is infectious, as even pupils from the lower grades were now copying the bad behaviour," he said.

He urged parents to exercise discipline to their chil-

dren at home. "I appeal to each and every parent present here to discipline your children.

A child who is not disciplined at home is evident here at school. As you know that the teachers' hands are tied pertaining the issue of administering corporal punishment to pupils, we plead with you to discipline your children," he said.

Thwala further said two grade one pupils were once found to have stolen some minor stationery at SAGM primary school.

He attributed this behaviour to lack of discipline from the parents.

...People tarnishing my good name – Thwala

MQOLO Central Primary Principal Archie Thwala has said some people were out to tarnishing his good name at the school.

Thwala said this when responding to a list of concerns that a portion of parents had raised pertaining to accusations made against

A parent who wanted to remain anonymous, in fear of victimisation of his child, revealed that they had major concerns about the principal and the way he runs the school.

'The major concern is the issue of end-of year financial for the school.

Every December he presents to us a statement that is confusing and unbalancing, and when we require an explanation he brushes us off and not attend to our concerns," he said.

The parent further said they were concerned with the fact that sometimes the school runs out of food yet as parents they witnessed government trucks delivering food at the school.

"In that school food lasts only a few weeks after government delivers it.

After that our children languish in hunger yet the food had been delivered," he said.

Revealed

He further revealed that they have already reported the matter concerning the end of year financials to the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) and they were contemplating taking it up to the Public Accounts Committee (PAC).

Responding to these allegations Thwala said everything they had said about him were fabricated lies and nothing else.

"There is no truth in any of the matters that they are bringing up against me. These people are just after tarnishing my good name.

I have worked hard ever since I got to this school in 2009. With my effort the schools' performance in standard five has greatly improved. It is a pity that they are now trying to create lies about me and my administration of the school," he said,

Thwala further revealed that during year end meetings he, together with the school committee, present the financial report to the parents in a meeting and explain everything to them.

Fabricating "I have a feeling the people, who are fabricating these stories about me are the good for nothing drunks from around here, as they have a vendetta against me. These boys are not even parents to any pupil in the school's," he said

Thwala revealed that a few weeks back the schools' security guard busted a number of boys, from the area stealing firewood from the school. He said he suspects they are the ones trying to ruin his good name.

Durban AIDS meet hear good circumcision news about SD

Half of the 80 percent of Swazi men we're targeting have already been circumcised

SWAZILAND has made considerable progress in rolling out Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision (VMMC), although this is a new intervention in HIV prevention in the country.

Making this observation at the 21st International AIDS Conference in Durban on Monday was Alfred Khehla Adams, the Swaziland Technical Director at the Centre for HIV/AIDS Prevention Studies (CHAPS).

CHAPS is an organisation that works with the ministry of health and other NGOs to deliver VMMC in the country. "Half of the 80 percent of Swazi men we're targeting have already been circumcised," Adams told delegates at a side event of the conference where over 18 000 people are deliberating on the topic: 'access equity rights now'.

VMMC is one of the strategies countries are using as a means of prevention in an effort to meet the global objective of ending AIDS by

While the country is on the right track in delivering VMMC, there are still some challenges regarding creating demand.
"Because it's a new intervention,

people were worried about the pain and also cultural issues because Swazis were not used to it," said Adams.

Changing

But that is rapidly changing following awareness programmes and targeting specific groups such as young men and creating awareness through activities that most men engage in such as soccer. The VMMC campaign in Swaziland has engaged soccer star, Dennis 'Yuki' Masina, as the brand ambassador. Adams said the response after engaging 'Yuki' was great because most of his fans wanted to emulate him by circumcis-

"We've signed a memorandum of understanding with the National Football Association of Swaziland to create a partnership in the male circumcision campaign," he said. More needs to be done by Swaziland and other countries though because they are failing to meet the global challenge of circumcising five million men annually. So far three million men are circumcised annually and this needs to change if the world is to meet the target of the

UNAIDS 2016-2021 Strategy. This target calls for the circumcision of 27 million men in highprevalence settings as part of their integrated sexual reproductive health services by 2021.

"Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision needs to be better institutionalised in countries," said UNAIDS chief prevention, Karl Dehne as he launched the Framework for Voluntary Medical Male Circumcision at the same event. UNAIDS coauthored this document together with WHO.

He said VMMC should be integrated into policies, school curriculum and big sporting events to ensure the picture was clear to everybody so

that each country is able to meet the 2021 target.

So far not everyone gets the idea, even in Swaziland where there is remarkable progress. Dr Pierre Somse, Deputy Director at the UNAIDS regional support team for Eastern and Southern Africa, told delegates he was shocked by the

response of a Swazi parliamentarian at the National HIV/AIDS on July 12 to 14. "The parliamentarian said male circumcision is useless because it has not reduced the rate of divorce and promiscuity," said Somse. He said this was evidence that more needs to be done with regards to educating people about the role of circumcision in HIV prevention. Somse said the messages being sent on male circumcision should make people

understand what it can and cannot achieve. "Reducing the rate of divorce and promiscuity is not the role of male

circumcision," said Somse.

"But we can't be dismissive, when we get people with this kind of information, it shows that the messages fall through the cracks."

Swaziland has committed itself to scale-up VMMC as part of 'Umgubudla: A Fast-track Programme Towards an AIDS-Free Swaziland,' launched by the Prime Minister, Sibusiso Dlamini last week. 'Umgubudla' states that VMMC provides 60 percent protection from new infection in heterosexual males. A further investment in VMMC will cost the country \$10 million between the 2014 and 2030.

The question that some delegates were asking were where will the money come from considering that the funding envelope for HIV/AIDS is shrinking. "Considering ending AIDS without increasing the funding is magical thinking," said AVAC Programme Director, Emily Bass. AVAC is a said global organisation that advocates for HIV prevention.

Lee Abdelfadil from the Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, said global funding towards the epidemic was shrinking and called for countries to be more efficient in what they do to reduce costs. The conference ends tomorrow. Minister of Health, SibongileNdlela-Simelane and National Emergency Response Council (NERCHA) Director, Khanya Mabuza, are leading the Swaziland delegation comprising of activists and health experts. Princess Sikhanyiso participated at pre-conference activities on Sunday before the start of the conference.

SWAZILAND'S COMART PROJECT PRESENTED AT AIDS2016 CONFERENCE

THE Swaziland National AIDS Programme (SNAP) on Monday presented its Community ART (ComART) programme to participants at the International AIDS Conference currently taking place at the ICC in Durban, South Africa.

The International AIDS Conference is the largest gathering on any global health or development issue in the world. First convened during the peak of the AIDS epidemic in 1985, the conference continues to provide a unique forum for the intersection of science, advocacy, and human rights.

Each conference is an opportunity to strengthen policies and programmes that ensure an evidencebased response to the epidemic.

About 18 000 scientists, policymakers, advocates and people living with HIV are attending the AIDS 2016 conference.

The conference, which ends tomorrow, will highlight the latest

accomplishments and challenges in a rapidly expanding area of scientific inquiry that few could have imagined - the prospect of developing safe, effective, and globally scalable approaches to curing or achieving sustained remission of HIV infection.

Swaziland, like many other countries, had an opportunity to share its best practices and also learn from other countries. Zimbabwe was the first to present during Monday afternoon's session. The Zimbabwean team stated that their programme had immensely decongested health facilities.

Aimed

The Swazi team, which was led by National ART Coordinator Dr Sthembile Lukhele, presented the ComART project, which, like the Zimbabwean one, is aimed at decongesting health facilities.

Dr Lukhele told the meeting that the country was making plans to adopt 'test and treat' in October, adding that the motivation gained momentum as the 90-90-90 came

in. she mentioned that the current World Health Organisation (WHO) allowed people with a CD4 of less that 500 to enrol on ART and thus more and more people are eligible to ART.

She said these models were attractive because they offered an opportunity to decongest the health facilities. She said while they wanted to increase ART coverage, they did not want to compromise on quality as the patients who are virally unsuppressed still needed time to walk them through.

She said also, because HIV is a chronic illness, they wanted to empower clients to be actively engaged in their care.

The team explained that people who are virally suppressed and are stable on ART are encouraged to form support clubs where they rotate in collecting medication from the hospital.

Discovered

This project was piloted since 2014 and it would soon be rolled out throughout the country. It was discovered that stable patients do not need much attention but just to collect their drugs, hence there was no need for all of them to come to the health facility unless they needed to be attended to by a clinician. The clients form their own groups and rotate in collecting ARVs from the hospital.

"This saves time which could be spent away from work whilst collecting drugs. It also saves money because only one person comes per month or in three months," reported Raymond Shabangu, a nurse who was part of the team.

EDUCATION, HEALTH MINISTERS ATTEND OPENING CEREMONY

THE AIDS 2016 conference kicked off on a high note on Monday and was officially opened by South **African Deputy President** Cyril Ramaphosa.

Members of the civic organisation, including gays and lesbians, took turns in addressing the gathering during the official opening of the meeting which was characterised by small demonstrations fromtime to time by HIV activists.

The meeting was attended by UNAIDS Executive Director Michel Sidibe and founder of the Charlize Theron Africa's Treatment Action Campaign Charlize Theron, among other speakers.

Among the Swazi delegation was Minister of Health Sibongile Ndlela-Simelane, Minister of Education and Training Phineas Magagula and his Principal Secretary Patrick Muir, Senator Bonsile Mngometulu, NER-CHA Director Khanya Mabuza and World Health Organisation (WHO) HIV/TB Officer Dr Sithembile Dlamini-Ngeketo.

Speaking during the meeting, Ramaphosa started by commending former African leaders who have been champions in the fight against HIV prevention.

These include, among others, former SA president Kgalema Motlante, former president Banda of Malawi, former president Joaquim Chissano of Mozambique, and former President Festus Mogae on Botswana.

"We have all been touched by this epidemic. Many lives have been lost as it has affected ordinary people, families have been torn apart, communities have been distressed, livelihoods have been lost and children have been orphaned," he lamented.

Devastating

Ramaphosa said the epidemic has a truly devastating impact on the quality of life of millions of people around the world. He said countries like South Africa where HIV has fundamentally changed the burden of disease, altered life expectancy, depleted health resources and put social support systems under extreme strain.

"This epidemic has changed our world and at the same time it has changed us. The struggle to end AIDS has galvanised the global community in an unprecedented way. It has provoked the sense of international solidarity and a

sense of common purpose. This virus has challenged all of us. It has required many of us to reconsider the beliefs that were long held to be true. We had to change the way we respond to epidemics. Countries had to redirect resources from other areas of critical needs to address this new challenge," he said.

The deputy president added that the virus requires comprehensive response. He said countries had to mobilise international agencies, governments, traditional leaders, the media donors, communities and more importantly individuals who confront HIV on a daily basis in their own lives.

He noted that for many countries, this has been a long journey with a number of challenges. He said for many, it has been a journey from difference, denial and transition to accepting and confronting directly the truths about this epidemic.

Adding Ramaphosa said; "Over the years the international AIDS conferences have been the fora that have borne witness to this journey. These conferences have advanced our understanding of the epidemic and have also raised our level of consciousness as well as provoked us and challenged our misconceptions, yet at the same time they have inspired us, giving us innovative ways of dealing with the epidemic.

They have also enabled us to travel a great distance.

UNAIDS wants 'blessers' on zero level

MICHEL Sidibe, the UNAIDS Executive Director, has comehard on the so called 'blessers' who put adolescent girls at the risk of contracting HIV in exchange for money.


Sidibe was speaking during the official opening of the AIDS 2016 conference in Durban, South Africa.

The opening was attended by among others, Ministers of Health and Education Senator Sibongile Ndlela-Simelane and Phineas Magagula respectively, PS Pat Muir, Senator Bonsile Mngometulu and WHO HIV/TB Officer Dr Sithembile Dlamini-Ngeketo.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) Swaziland country office has also sent two electronic media journalists to cover the event.

Commitment

In his remarks, Sidibe said the event, AIDS 2016 must mark the commitment to finish what was started and fast-track the end of AIDS. He said while much was on track, some things have gone way



off-track, and as a consequence much time has been lost, as well as momentum and many lives.

"I am fired up, because in some African countries, 25 percent of young women will become infected with HIV before they turn 25. If we do not empower young women and girls, stop the violence and provide access to comprehensive sexuality education and sexual reproductive health services and rights, we cannot stop new infections. Young women need options to protect themselves that don't depend on men. And as to the 'blessers', there is only one level I want see. I want the zero level. Zero tolerance for men who put adolescent girls at risk of HIV," he said.

Targets

He said the 90–90–90 targets had been embraced by the world, and noted however, that complacency had become the new conspiracy thus it must be broken.

"Our progress is incredibly fragile. If we do not act now, we risk resurgence and resistance. Today, I am sounding the alarm on prevention.

"Progress on stopping new infections has stalled for adults. In some countries new HIV infections are going up. We need to invest in young women, harm reduction, pre-exposure prophylaxis, condoms, voluntary medical male circumcision, social protection and community action," he said.

Sidibe said by 2020, all countries and communities should have reduced the number of new infections by 75 percent.

Approach

He said to achieve this, there was need for innovation in health systems, need to reengineer the approach to health delivery and keep the focus on the community.

He said zero discrimination in health-care settings was non-negotiable. There was need for people centred systems that integrate tuberculosis, Hepatitis C, cancer and reproductive health services.

Adding, he said there was need for continued investment and innovation in research that would deliver the vaccine and cure waiting to be discovered.

Adding, Sidibe noted that civil society was being squeezed from

all sides. He said the bold voices that should be heard were being silenced. He appealed to governments to open the space for community activism, even when it is uncomfortable, adding that without civil society, there was no AIDS response.

Infections

"We know we are leaving people behind. When key populations still account for 35 percent of new infections, where is our outrage? We know how to reach gay men and other men who have sex with men, sex workers, people who inject drugs, transgender people and prisoners, as well as migrants. Too often we label key populations as hard to reach, but the truth is; we do not try very hard to reach them," he said.

Sidibe said by 2020, the worldwould need US\$ 26 billion for the AIDS response. He said the world needs a fully-funded Global Fund to fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria.

"If we are serious about ending AIDS, it is high time for a new political discussion on how to make funding sustainable and predictable, he said.



FARMERS ASSOCIATION RETRENCHES 20 WORKERS

FINANCIAL difficulties have forced a sugar association at Dvokolwako to retrench over 20 workers in a space of two months,

An employee at Kwasa Farmers Association, who preferred anonymity, said his immediate supervisor told them to stop coming to work as the association was in financial crisis.

He alleged that six shareholders of the troubled Kwasa
Farmers Association were keen to have a special meeting with SwaziBank board members to discuss their financial woes.

The employee said management only reinstated two employees out of the more than 20 for security reasons.

Retaliation

The job cuts have had a detrimental effect on operations, according to the source.

He said in retaliation, the troublesome residents have damaged the fence in order to steal the sugar cane.

"The farm has become a graz-

ing land. Cattle farmers do not struggle for grazing land anymore," said the source.

He added that the water pump was left hanging at the Mbuluzi River since the association has not paid electricity.

He said a month later the two employees reinstated also abandoned the farm as they were not paid.

Aggrieved

"They worked for two extra months unpaid until they decided to terminate their services as well. As we speak operations are at standstill at the farm," the aggrieved retrenched employee said.

The employee said there were slim chances of harvesting this year since the company was sinking in huge debts. He alleged that the six shareholders were also at loggerheads over the matter as some blame the other for misusing funds.

Employees work 5 months without pay

KWASA Farmers Association staff worked without pay for almost five consecutive months.

An employee who preferred anonymity said they were retrenched without pay by their immediate supervisors.

"We were told that as soon as they get financial assistance from the bank they will to pay us. To date we are still waiting," the employee said.

He said they have been living a painful life for more than six months.

"Both cleaners and security personnel have not been paid for far too long." He said the association

held accountable for failure to pay us timeously, as seemingly they are comfortable with us working without any financial returns."

The source said currently they were at home with no job and a source of income. "We solely depend on these salaries for our day to day expenses."

Association in E10m arrears

KWASA Farmers Association situated at Dvokolwako near Malamlela Primary School is in arrears amounting to E10 million with SwaziBank.

According to the Chairman of

the association Ellen Masuku, SwaziBank stopped funding them as it claimed they were in arrears.

Funding

As a result of lack of funding from the bank, Masuku said they failed to honour their debts and salaries for the staff.

"We have tried to meet with SwaziBank's board to discuss the matter and were informed that we are in arrears," Masuku said. She confirmed that operations at the farm were at standstill since the bank stopped funding them because of the E10 million debt.

Choice

Masuku said they were left with no choice but to retrench some of their workers because of lack of operational funds.

Meanwhile, SwaziBank Public

Relations Officer Phesheya Vilakati when sought for comment, said the matter touched on customer confidentiality. "Unfortunately, we cannot com-

ment on this matter," he said.

However, Vilakati said they were in discussions with the association regarding all matters of their operations and finance.

HLUTI MP'S NOT SO EASY TASK TO WIN 2018 ELECTIONS

RESIDENTS of Hluti will only vote their Member of Parliament Thulani Masuku, back to parliament in 2018, if the area is declared a town soonest.

The residents said for Masuku to win the race, he should utilise the remaining period to convince relevant authorities to act swiftly in declaring Hluti a town.

"He must make sure that he leaves office with Hluti given the town board status, otherwise he might as well kiss the next parliament term goodbye.


AN angry crowd that had been promised food parcels almost manhandled Mtsambama Member of Parliament (MP) Mphaya Simelane as that promise was not fulfilled.

The MP was verbally attacked together with his constituency team.

A drought mitigation programme was recently released where different dates were announced as to where food distribution would occur, especially in areas that were hit hard by drought.

In some of the parts of Shiselweni, people had lined up to have the distribution conducted this week.

At Mtsambama Inkhundla, such an exercise was marred by problems that nearly led to the exchange of blows.



This was after it was realised that the exercise was a nonstarter and many returned home empty handed.

Families

It is said a crowd of 60 to 100 people had assembled at Magele and Ekwendzeni chiefdoms on Monday.

The residents were hoping to benefit from a food distribution exercise which had been scheduled in the area as announced by government. Some residents arrived at their distribution points (chiefdoms) very early, but unfortunately had to go back home late and empty handed.

The residents were advised to return on another date.

On Monday, the residents from these two chiefdoms (Magele and Ekwendzeni) were part of those that were earmarked to receive food parcels, however, such never happened.

Reports were that at
Ekwendzeni chiefdom, an area
under Chief Makhosikhosi
(Khumalo), things could have
turned nasty if it was not for the
quick intervention of the headman of the umphakatsi
Sibonginkosi Dlamini.

The angry residents were not prepared to listen to any stories upon realising they would not be getting any food.

The team had only come to monitor and assist in seeing that the distribution exercise was carried out smoothly.

However, the angry residents instead blamed the team for not getting anything and returning to their respective homes empty handed.

MP asked to initiate speed humps

MEMBERS of the Hluti business community want their Member of Parliament Thulani Masuku to pressurise government to construct speed humps along the busy part of the road close to the police station and post office.

Bahle Sibandze, who is the Chairman of the business community, said along that road, close to 10 lives had already been lost.

He said had there been speed humps, the accidents would have been avoided.

"Just a month or two ago, a child was knocked down by a speeding vehicle. There were other fatalities and there will be more if nothing is done. Constructing speed humps is not so expensive, we just need only two to avoid all these accidents. Yes, he is not a development officer, but his other work as MP is addressing problems which are a cause for concern and affect the people he represents," said Sibandze.

He said the MP knew the route to follow when help was needed. As a business community, they relied on the MP to assist them on things that touched on the lives of the people.

"He should not think he is being abused, surely we are not asking for too much as this is part of the package of his role as people's representative.

Together with the rest of the constituency team, they are there to serve us. The road in question is used by many people including those from other countries who enter through Lavumisa or Mahamba Border Gates.

Some of the people make a stopover at Hluti as we are a passage of Nhlangano and Lavumisa towns," said Sibandze.

A business community, they were praying that not a single life was lost, especially along the road passing through Hluti. Meanwhile, MP Masuku said the issue of speed humps along the road next to the police station would be looked into.

He said the relevant department has been approached and he was optimistic the request to have speed humps built would be considered.

"Actually, I am working on this, as I am aware of the many fatalities occurring along this road. It's not like I am not aware of this. It should be known that some of these things take time and there is money involved, as there has to be a budget for any project," said MP Masuku.

Inkhundla team freeze as angry residents demand answers

MP Mphaya Simelane confirmed how they were verbally attacked by the mob from the two chiefdoms.

He said, the adage: 'a hungry man is an angry man' rang true here as the angry residents cornered him.

"Things almost got out of hand when they were informed there will be no food distribu-

They had waited almost the whole day and only learned late that there were technicalities being experienced by the distribution team," said the MP.

He said it was a tense situation as the people felt undermined

because of their plight.

Programme

"Bebafuna kusidla luhlata batfukutsele bagane lunwabu," said the MP.

He exonerated himself and his team from the sudden turn of events.

"Ours is just to monitor and we are not to blame for the exercise not taking place. What is consoling us is the Caritas team promised they will be back on Monday to distribute food to the people from the two chiefdoms," said the MP.

Mtsambama Indvuna Yenkhundla Mboni Simelane also echoed the MP's words saying they were now waiting for next week Monday.

Mlamuli Dlamini, a senior member of the ruling household at Magele Umphakatsi, also confirmed how the people got infuriated after the programme was cancelled at the eleventh hour.

Patience

"Fortunately, the Caritas team assured us that next week, Monday, the distribution will take place and we urge the community to be patient," said Dlamini also once served as MP of Mtsambarna after the demise of Bheki 'No Problem' Mkhonta.

Meanwhile, yesterday a similar

scenario unfolded at Ebenezer as again food distribution failed to take place.

According to MP Simelane, it was the same excuse that was given.

"It's bad and I think the people tasked with the exercise have to put their house in order. We are told that one truck is used to transport the food from where it is fetched.

The other thing we are told is the food distribution exercise must be once and for all. If beans have not arrived, then the maize cannot be distributed. These are some of the excuses we get," said MP Simelane.

COMESA boss's body guards get people talking

SECURITY provided to Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COME-SA) Secretary General Sindiso Ngwenya had tongues wagging during a handover ceremony of a climate smart agricultural project last week at Mpatheni.

Ngwenya officiated the handover of upscaling climate smart agriculture technologies project, last week Thursday, where other dignitaries included Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati, Ministry of Agriculture Principal Secretary Bongani Masuku, Commerce, Industry and Trade PS Jinnoh Nkambule also attended.

Others included NAMBOARD Chief Executive Officer Siphephiso Dlamini and Sithembiso Gina, who is UNDP Programme Specialist. Members of Parliament (MPs), including those of the portfolio committee (for Agriculture), also attended the event. MPs present included Sicelo Jele (LaMgabhi), Mphaya Simelane (Mtsambama), Mandla Nxumalo (Shiselweni I) and Jeremiah Ndwandwe (Ndzingeni).

The manner in which Ngwenya

was escorted by his bodyguards drew attention of event's attendants. The plain clothed bodyguards would surround the SG when he stood.

When seated, the bodyguards would stand side by side Ngwenya.

The event's attendants were taken aback by this and others even wondered if Ngwenya's position was on par with that of presidents or Heads of state

Ngwenya is a Zimbabwean but the COMESA Secretariat Offices are at Lusaka, Zambia.

Every step he took, the body-

guards were next to him, they did not want to lose sight of him.

When touring the project, Ngwenya's bodyguards tailed

At the tent, where the main event was held, for the duration of the programme, the body guards were standing, two of them next to him and another one a few metres away and did not lose sight of the SG.

One of the MPs who were part of the event commented in an interview that the security enjoyed by Ngwenya suited his status.

"We noticed this as we were the first one to arrive with the minister at the venue where the event was held. Just when Ngwenya arrived, we saw men walking at his side and what I also noticed, when we were near the dam during the tour, the bodyguards paid full attention of anything taking place around him," said the MP.

When contacted, Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba said it was against the police service ethics to publicly comment on security provided to a VIP.

He said while he was not part of the event at Mpatheni, even if he had, he could not comment when he would be asked why Ngwenya seemed to provided with such a 'shield' that was only known to be enjoyed by high profile peo-

"As police, we don't discuss security provided to a VIP. Body guards or any security that is provided to anyone of important status, we discuss public domain and there is not even a need to ask me why. Take what I am telling you. You can't just go public that so and so is enjoying high security for this and that. Such arrangements are not discussed anyhow," said Supt Mamba.



him and he pleaded guilty to all the charges.


Mtsetfwa pleaded with the court to be lenient with him as he did not know what he was doing.

"I plead with the court to be lenient with me because I was too drunk. The problem might be with the fact that I do not drink too much alcohol," Mtsetfwa said.

Nhlabatsi advised Mtsetfwa to stop drinking alcohol and further fined him E800 or to spend six months in a correctional facility. On the second count, the magistrate fined him E2 000 or to face spending a year in prison. Nhlabatsi then wholly suspended the sentence for three years. She told him that he should not be found to have committed any road traffic offence or any offence that had to do with defeating the ends of justice.

Swazi fined R750 SA for over speedi

A Swazi man was shocked when he was handed a R750 ticket for over speeding in South Africa.

The incident happened on June 24, 2016 just outside the Oshoek Border Gate.

Sikhumbuzo Dlamini, of Matitila in Nkomazi, was driving to Witbank when nabbed by the South African Police Service (SAPS), traffic department.

He said he was travelling to South Africa to buy clothes with the intention to sell them locally.

"The police officer fined me for over speeding.

"I was driving at 65 km/h in an area where I was supposed to drive at 60 km/h. What shocked me is that I was handed a ticket ordering me to pay a fine of R750," Dlamini said.

Advantage

He said he thought the police officer took advantage of the fact that he was a Swazi.

He said he could not afford the R750 that was demanded from him.

Dlamini said, what shocked him was the ticket, which stated he had been driving at a speed of 79km/h.

He said what also shocked him was the incident happened when he had just departed from the border.

The police are said to have mounted a speed trap at a distance of not more than 200 metres from Dlamini's point of departure.

"That is why I say I was given the ticket because I was taken for a ride, probably because I am a Swazi.

How can I drive at such a speed when I had just departed from the border?" he asked.

When Dlamini asked the police officer to show him the footage of the speed trap, the police

refused, telling Dlamini that he was not the only person he had to attend to.

Dlamini is supposed to appear before court in Nhlazatje to answer on the alleged crime he committed. He is supposed to appear on August 24, 2016.

Chief Police Communications and Information Officer (CPICO) Superintendent Khulani Mamba could not be reached for comment on the matter. His cell phone first rang unanswered. When the second attempt was made, he was not available. The Swazi Observer wanted to know if the police could offer any assistance to Dlamini.

MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE (MR)

WHILE attending the 2016 International AIDS Conference in Durban, South Africa, I reflect on South Africa's first hosting in 2000, when the late statesman, Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela opened the International AIDS Conference and provided a pivotal moment with his call for all "to break the silence, banish stigma and discrimination, and ensure total inclusiveness within the struggle against AIDS".

This helped turn around the tide on an epidemic that had seen the funeral industry become the most thriving business in the region.

One of the immediate fruits of the 2000 conference and supported by the 2001 UN Political Declaration on HIV/AIDS was the roll out of antiretroviral treatment (ARV medicines) that gave hope to people living with HIV (PLHIV) to longer and productive lives. For South Africa, however, there were many challenges and the country only introduced ART in 2005. Today however, South Africa has the largest number of people on ART, with over three million people on treatment. These life-saving drugs are seen as a means not only to allow PLHIV to live healthier lives, but have proven HIV prevention capacity.

Given the reported treatment successes and therefore the renewed drive to end AIDS by 2030 (2022 for Swaziland) global experience tells us that bio-medical interventions alone will not end AIDS.

MALE INVOLVEMENT FOR BETTER ACCESS, EQUITY IN HIV RESPONS

There still remains fragile communities alongside the scars left by the burning fire of HIV and AIDS. Issues of gender inequality, sexual violence, annihilation and discrimination and adolescent girls that are preyed on by men playing predators continue to provide an environment in which HIV infection thrives, especially among women and girls.

Not with-standing the fact HIV remains to have the face of a woman (a young one for that matter), AIDS-related deaths carry the face of men (as a result of late HIV testing and enrolment into care). On Tuesday 19th July, the International AIDS conference hosted the Sweden's Satellite Session which focused on male involvement for better access and equity in the HIV response. The objectives of the session were to: Share experiences and highlight lessons learnt from HIV and AIDS programmes that have successfully been employed in male engagement as a strategy; Discuss the role that leadership and an enabling policy environment play in enhancing male engagement in the HIV response; and Collectively reflect on the factors that influence male involvement at society level and strategies to increase the engagement of boys and men in the HIV response.

Country's voice in male involvement

The National Emergency Council on HIV and AIDS (NERCHA) Director Khanya Mabuza was a panellist together with Dr.Chewe Luo (Associate Director Programme Division and Head of the HIV Section, UNICEF Headquarters, USA) and Reverend Bafana Khumalo (Director of Strategic Partnerships, Sonke Gender Justice, South Africa) in the session that was moderated by Michaela Clayton, Executive Director, AIDS and Rights Alliance for Southern Africa.

"The skewed economy and patriarchy contribute to the spread of

HIV in Swaziland," Mabuza stated. He said gender dynamics play a role in perpetuating HIV because those who don't have money are exploited by those who have it, noting that in Swaziland 90 percent of the 10 percent of people with money are men, rendering women basically dependent on males.

Reflecting on national HIV incidence data, he stated that

Swaziland's most at risk population is young girls who have a higher HIV incidence four percent in the age group 20 to 24 compared to 1.7% among their male counterparts. of the same age group.

Mabuza presented that this evidence shows that the young girls are not getting HIV from their age mates but from older men as shown by increased intergenerational sex in the country which has peaked from seven percent in 2007 to 15 percent in 2014.

"HIV practitioners often talk of young girls as the ones spreading HIV," said Mabuza, but intergenerational transmission of HIV is real. Data shows that condom use among young women and men aged 25-35 is similarly very low, showing some connection between these two heterosexual population groups.

He also observed that alcohol consumption among young girls is high and this is sponsored by men (who control the money and the economy) with the common exchange being sex.

The NERCHA director also decried the fact that even when on treatment, most men do not adhere to treatment hence have high viral loads, making them highly infectious.

The fact that Swaziland is a patriarchal society embedded in cultural practices does not help the situation because some cultural practices promote the spread of HIV. Common ones include wife inheritance and forced marriages of young girls spread HIV (Not restricted to Swaziland alone).

Positive Impact of cultural practices

Mabuza reflected that we cannot speak about culture without also recognising its positive role, presenting that some cultural practices that curb the spread of HIV include the Umhlanga and Lusekwane events..

"Let's catch boys and girls while they're still young. Once you do that, you'll have a complete balance," implored Mabuza. He noted that government continues to implement policy interventions targeting young boys and girls and the free primary education programme is likely to improve their social and economic conditions. Main streaming HIV and AIDS and providing social protection for adolescent boys and girls is likely to keep young boys and girls at school and reduce new HIV infection rates. The need to incorporate gender issues into the school curriculum and have both boys and girls treated equally will close the gender gap.

"At community level, there is need to work with men by properly consulting them, instead of the common practice of talking to them since men are very individualistic. Let us make sure to use strategies that target men as well as mentor young men to become better and responsible adults in their roles as fathers and leaders in the communities," said Mabuza.

Uganda experience

According to Dr Chewe Luo, men should be engaged in gender initiatives because their behaviour impacts on women. She further noted that social and cultural values that promote gender imbalance ultimately, affect maternal child health negatively. While women seek health services that end up benefitting their male partners, men hardly do that.

Dr Luo shared findings from a study in Uganda which showed that men do not like to wait for long in queues at health facilities.

"Men also complained that health practitioners give them attitude when they accompany their partners," she said.

The session presented that women have done a lot in the fight against HIV and that if we are to make a meaning full impact on controlling the spread of HIV as well as protect women and girls the re-ignited HIV response needs to target men as key players for ending AIDS. Deliberations on this issue and more continue at the IAS as countries try to find ways to end AIDS by 2030.

His Majesty's leadership in the HIV response

His Majesty King Mswati III's continued demonstrated leadership in the HIV response should serve as a catalyst for positive individual behaviours. In recent times, His Majesty has called on the nation to ensure that no Swazi should get infected with HIV, as well as pronounced that gender based violence as unSwazi and demonic.

The King's call is a challenge to men to get more involved and ensure that no one, especially adolescent girls and young women, are infected with HIV. It gives us all, especially men in this context, the responsibility to test and know our status, to get treatment and adhere to the treatment so that viral load is suppressed - and in-turn, positively affect transmission. This is the 90.90.90 target.

Men, like all people, must respond to the call and use all the options available to them. They must circumcise, use condoms, and reduce sexual partners. Young boys need proper guidance to become better partners, be circumcised and practice abstinence until a time when they are ready to engage in sexual activity.

When men and boys do these, they will meaningfully contribute to end AIDS by 2022. There is need to ensure that each one of us living with HIV, lives to see the end of AIDS

OY DREAMS OF H FREE ADOLESCENTS

US ambassador initiates programme to reduce adolescents' vulnerability to HIV infection

IT'S a Saturday midmorning at the Emhlangeni Primary School in LaMgabhi Constituency, and one of the classes brims with pre and adolescents converged here as part of the US Ambassador's Community Grants on Adolescents programme.

Driven by the local chapter of Women and Law Southern Africa (WLSA), the Emhlangeni project is aimed at reducing the adolescents' vulnerability to HIV infection and its consequences.

The ambassador's project further intends availing small scale grants to help address a range of HIV related adolescent issues in the country and among new programmes funded by PEPFAR with hopes to stem the HIV pandemic among this group that has not been reached despite being highly vulnerable.

They meet on Saturdays to receive life skills education from speakers with the relevant expertise and encouraged to ask questions of whatever nature.


The setting is informal, allowing them to relax and broach subjects otherwise taboo in the family setting, where sex education has been shirked by those who should be addressing it, the par-

This could be due to the disintegration of the family unit, which has seen some parents deliberately relinquishing this role to schools and teachers.

But reality is that the country's curriculum does not cover sex education, hence adolescents then lack the capacity to make sound sexual decisions and are thus rendered sitting ducks for sexual predators while risking early pregnancies and HIV infection.

This reality is witnessed in the cackles of timid giggles that ripple through the classroom as the adolescents are taken through presentations on 'blessers', selfesteem, dangers of early sexual debut, peer pressure and related

If statistics are any guide, adolescent girls have every reason to be here. According to the Swaziland Demographic Health Survey Guide (SDHS 2006-2007) the current HIV prevalence rate stands at 26 percent while the country has recorded one of the world's highest prevalence rates.



Over the years, the country has indeed made remarkable progress in the prevention and spread of HIV through behaviour change campaigns and other initiatives. But according to UNICEF, the risk of becoming infected with HIV in Swaziland remained disproportionately higher for girls and young women.

UNICEF further found that in Swaziland, 15.6 percent of young women were HIV positive compared to 6.5 of young men.

Such factors and many more highlight the importance of equipping adolescents with practical skills to help them steer clear from contracting the disease and skilfully navigate the maze of life to avoid lifelong damnation, broken dreams and eternal regret.

To eradicate HIV once and for all, new infections must be prevented in young women and girls like the ones in this class. While much headway has been made in the 35 years after the AIDS outbreak, infection rate among young women has barely decreased for reasons mostly social and economical.

Gender and anti-HIV activists have also continuously trumpeted their concern that the face of the pandemic coupled with poverty has always worn a woman's face.

Since many governments seemingly cannot figure out how this could be altered, it then becomes imperative that empowering children, girls especially, be included in the efforts to reverse such a

depressing tide.

The 2016 UNAIDS report states that "harmful gender norms and inequalities, obstacles to education and sexual and reproductive health services, poverty, food insecurity and violence" play a major role in the high infection rates in Sub-Saharan Africa while experts say sexual violence is common as women don't have much bargaining power in their relationships.

Self-esteem

Then add low self-esteem as another persistent challenge in this toxic mix of emotional skulduggery the adolescents, especially girls, have to contend with.

15-year-old Tibekile* is among the girls in this Emhlangeni classroom. Her situation is dire, being the eldest of double orphaned children living with their elderly grandmother.

For her and her siblings, existence is a daily grind and they barely make ends meet at times relying on the generosity of neighbours and the old woman's meagre elderly stipend that comes every trimester.

Luckily, the children go to school through the government's free primary education programme, where they also receive a measly corn, soya and beans blend meal.

She, like a handful others at the Saturday sessions, has more reasons to attend as their poverty and even teen angst, could spur them into the temptations of early sexual debut and many other

unsavoury situations.

Then enter the "blessers" - older men who support hapless girls financially in exchange for sexual relationships. The term evolved from the social media hashtag #blessed, which some women use to refer to gifts from their

Naturally, some of these blessers will not want to use condoms. Most of the girls, bowing to pressure will tend to trust them, even though they know they are married and with a sizeable number of 'on the sly lovers' with whom they father babies, a fate which also awaits them and is layered with HIV infection.

"Most sugar daddies will not use a condom - which means you also can't wear one. This then means you should say no to sex whatever the circumstances until you are able to control your fate and destiny. Attaining an education can empower you to call the shots," the facilitator tells the girls.

But she can never be sure whether her warnings will be heeded or not.

Peer and economical pressure is intense among adolescent girls and they often pair up with older men who buy them the latest fads like cellphones and trendy clothing. They take them out to exotic places in exchange for sexual favours, which drive HIV infection as the girls are mostly powerless to negotiate for safe sex.

Hence the need for such programmes where the adolescents can be empowered on how to prioritise their health, value their selves, put first their education above all and stand firm on their convictions while making wise life choices.

They must be convinced that tailure to do so equals a cocktail of HIV and AIDS, perpetual serfdom and an acute cycle of dreadful poverty.

Despite their backgrounds, the Emhlangeni adolescents are encouraged to dream big and availed skills to duel with the odds stacked along their quest for greatness while being aided to reach for a life free of the trammels of HIV and AIDS.

Changing behaviour, despite being an uphill odyssey can surely remove the obstacles on the path to HIV free adolescents.

RAISING UP A CHILD WIT DISABILITY; MY PRIDE

AS a result of numerous problems being faced by parents and families who are caring for children with disability, consultants on persons with disability have began rolling out useful information to help them out in Accra, Ghana.

This article is part of a series of educational tit bits for parents with children with disability. Beneath the article is the contact address of the consultant specialists for those who need help on disability issues.

Parenting has been around from the days of Adam and Eve. Parenthood brings along a host of responsibilities. This principle holds whether the child is with or without disability. The birth of a child with any form of disability is usually received with disappointment and apprehension in a family. Parents' reactions to this type of situation include acceptance of the child and his/her disability, denial of the effects of the disability, over-protection, disguised rejection and overt rejec-

Parents most often are confronted with challenges of accepting or rejecting the situation. Whilst some parents come to terms with the situation and accept the child with full responsibility, others reject the child and shift the responsibility to society. The trauma and turbulence associated with the acceptance or rejection of a child with disability is to a large extent rooted in the absence of education and systems to support parents and their children with disability.

In Ghana, parents with children who are disabled have limited information about early intervention or referral centers. They battle with the situation until the children are ready for school. Even in this situation; there is usually an information gap between the parent and the teacher/special teacher.

The upbringing of children with disability is a rare uphill task for parents in Ghana. In most cases, the parents lack the requisite skills and knowledge to support the children during the pre school, school and transition

The writers' motivation is to share knowledge on the role of parents' at the specific stages of their children's development. This article focuses on the parent's role during the early intervention stage/pre-school.

EARLY INTERVENTION /PRESCHOOL STAGE

Early intervention refers to various activities designed to serve children with disability from zero to about four years or when such children are ready to begin formal schooling. Human develop-

ment is rapid in the early years and critical especially for children with defective sensory capabilities.

Therefore early stimulation of all parts of the bodies of such children is essential. Parent's knowledge in early intervention activities should be focused on the following areas among others:

- Food
- Sensory stimulation
- Conducive environment
- · Learning by doing
- Mannerism

FOOD

The healthy physical development of every human being depends to a large extent on a balanced diet. Parents should therefore endeavour to acquire knowledge about what constitutes a balanced diet and what specific dietary requirement will be beneficial to their children's conditions. If possible, parents should seek regular advice or help from a dietician who will guide them to procure cheap but nutritious food items that will aid the development of their child.

SENSORY STIMULATION

The provision of adequate sensory stimulations provides the brain with useful energy to develop and integrate its functions. If children are to develop intellectually, socially and physically well, sensory integration is very impor-

For instance, in the case where the child has a visual disability, parents should be assisted by specialists to explore, identify and in

addition know how to provide sensory stimulation to the various degrees of the child's response to smells, textures, sounds and tastes.

CONDUCIVE ENVIRON-MENT

The parents should create an environment which does not impede the children's movement or pose danger for injury to them when crawling or walking. When caring for a child with visual impairment, parents should ensure that the child gets used to enriched environment and wellstructured space to play in. Jingles and other sound producing toys should be provided by the parents in the environment to enhance play activities for movements. The articles for play should include those for taste, smell, touch, bang and drop.

LEARNING BY DOING

Children with disability need to be purposefully shown or taught by their parents concerning how to do things.

Unless they are taught, they will not know how to do it because they lack sight, hearing, and the use of arms or legs and so on for incidental learning.

Children with visual loss, for example, should be taught how to crawl by parents getting on the floor with their children and taking them through the movements until the children know what crawling is, and learn to do it themselves. Parents have to introduce toys to their children and show them how to play with

MANNERISM

The children with visual impairment during the infant stage develop socially negative manners. These are poking of their eyes, walking with their face upwards, swinging the head continuous sideways and body rock-

This is due to lack of early stimulation. Parents should check that and develop activities that will engage their infants and will prevent them from forming bad habits which become difficult to stop when they grow up.

Parents should check and constantly correct these types of mannerisms.

The development of every child at the early stages is very critical. Parents with children who have any form of disability must continue to seek knowledge on how best to raise their children without further complicating their situations.

Who is responsible for offering early intervention services to parents with disabled children? It is obvious that there is the need for a multi-sectoral approach in the development of a well- structured information system for parents with disabled children to seek knowledge on the development of their children.

The ministry of gender and social protection, the ministry of health and the ministry of education should take a second look at the trainings offered to social workers, community health nurses and nursery/special teachers.

We need to create the system for that purpose; be involved. ghanaweb

JM Busha's real return fund for the six months ending June 30, 2016 recorded an impressive 9.8 percent to beat inflation and deliver real growth for investors.


According to the company's real return fund fact sheet statement, the fund has returned since inception an annualised return of about 10.44 percent to its investing clients for period ended June 30.

Although not advisable, said the managers, clients can withdraw their investments at any time.

The fund holds a number of reputable firms as its top equity hold-

For instance Sasol, financial services giant Old Mutual, private bank Investec, private hospital group Mediclinic and mining giant Sasol.

JM BUSHA Investment Group (Pty) Limited has subsidiary companies in Lesotho, Namibia, Swaziland, South Africa and Zambia.

However, the report said the prices of unit trusts vary day-byday and so they could be different the next day. Furthermore these were historical returns for the periods reported therefore they were not guaranteed in the future.

The minister said the promotion of value chains nationally, regionally and globally would promote intra-trade and deepen integration to achieve the African Union Agenda 2063.


"We must maximise our efforts to increase capacities of local industries such that the investment climate encourages innovation which creates high technological employment."

Inflation in line with CBS projections

THE country's inflation rate is now in-line with the projections of the Central Bank of Swaziland.

According to CBS research and forecasting section 2016-2018 report, CBS anticipated that July inflation would be 7.09 percent and currently inflation is around 7.5 percent.

CBS's inflation forecast for 2016-2018 report projects inflation for 2016 to bottom out by year end at about 7 percent from the current high of 7.38 percent.

However, it is said that inflation forecasting is not an exact science and as a result, the inflation forecast rate is usually off the exact inflation rate.

The central theme for the monetary policy of the CBS of inflation targeting, is keeping inflation between the bands three to six percent.

This policy was now being questioned as inflation now is more than 2.5 basis points higher than the band.

"Inflation for the third quarter of 2016 is forecasted to decrease from current levels to about 6.95 percent, however could gain traction in the final quarter of the year and increase to 7.56 percent," reads the report as part.

Paper report

According to a working paper report published by the International Monetary Fund on inflation targeting, underpinning the whole monetary policy of inflation targeting is the ability of the central bank, (in this case CBS), to forecast the inflation rate.

UNISWA Head of Department of economics Dr Dumisile Dlamini reportedly said the monetary policy framework of inflation which was being pursued by government was facing serious challenges at the moment.

"However to say that the policy is defunct or should be altogether thrown out would be hasty; it should just be revisited," she said.

The monetary economist proposed that the inflation target band be set to keep it in line with realities of the economy. "For one thing the inflation target band should reflect the current socioeconomic climate of the country," she said.

The policy of the central bank is to raise interest rates if inflation is above the upper limit.

Therefore it follows that it would be reasonable to expect interest rates will not come down in the short to medium

Consumer association applauds Consumer Protection Bill

THE Swaziland Consumer Association has applauded the modernisation of the draft Fair Trade and Consumer Protection Bill, 2016.

SCA Chairman Bongani Mdluli said the association was happy that the draft Bill includes that people have a right to get their money back if they are unsatisfied with the product they have purchased.


"Consumers must understand that there is no such thing as 'thatile thatile' and retailers who practice this are breaking the law," he said.

"Thatile thatile' is a yernacular term for the practice of retailers not to accept products that have been sold to consumers and which the consumer may not return, even if they are faulty.

Mdluli said the draft Bill was a combination of the previous Acts, "and I am happy that most of the salient issues have been included." The Bill was presented to stakeholders by the main drafter of the Bill, University of Minnesota Law Professor Prentiss Cox.

The consultant, in his presentation, said the current draft for the Bill was an amalgamation of the Fair Trade Act, 2001 and Section 33 of the Competition Act, 2007.

The associate professor of law

said the Act, as envisaged, would be enforced by the Swaziland Competition Commission (SCC), as opposed to the previous legislation when the Fair Trade Act was administered by the ministry of commerce, industry and trade and Section 33 of the Competition Act was administered the SCC.

Noteworthy is that as published in or sister publication, the

Sunday Observer, only two Bills out of 31 tabled before parliament this year.

The Fair Trade and Consumer Protection Bill, 2016 has not yet been tabled yet an already there is a backlog.

Thus this has raised the question when this Bill will be tabled and passed into an Act of Parliament.

Another Bill that consumers

have been looking forward to, is the Consumer Credit Bill (Bill No. 15 of 2015) and the Consumer Protection Bill.

With a consumer protection laws, consumers will not be subjected to sale of unsafe products, hoarding of goods, using wrong weights and measures, charging excessive prices and sale of inferior quality goods.

The passage of the National Consumer Protection Bill is critical for the economy as it will aid stimulate economic growth in Swaziland and safeguard the consumer from exploitation.

This assertion was made by Swaziland Consumer Forum President Mandla Ntshakala earlier this year and still this Bill has not been passed.

"We hope this Bill will be passed in parliament this year as it provides the requisite legal rights. The law should also create an inspectorate, this will serve as the enforcement instrument of the laws, to ensure that the laws are adhere to by all business practitioners," said Ntshakala,

"Education and communication is also important as it will serve to educate consumers of their rights and gives them confidence to take legal action against companies who have reneged of their duties and obligations," he added.

CONSUMERS FLOCK CENTURY FASHIONS FOR CLEARANCE SALE

CENTURY Fashions treated consumers to a clearance sale yesterday.

At around 9 o'clock in the morning the shop was already sprawling with consumers who were looking to buy items from the shop.

Some consumers said they had temporarily ditched work just to be able to buy the items on offer by the shopping establishment.

One shopper named Muzi Matsebula said he could not leave this kind of sale and had travelled quite a distance to be able to catch the sale.

Another shopper who declined to be named said he had arrived as early as 7am and waited outside to ensure he got the items he wanted.

Some items in the store were 80 percent off.

Expecting more

Century Fashions Manager Monsur Chowdhury said, "We were expecting more customers, but it is still early in the day, traffic could still pick up."

The manager revealed that business this year has not been as robust as last year.

"We have observed that customers this year are less willing to spend their money on clothes and other accessories," he said.

Chowdhury said the volume of traffic for the sale is not what they were use to when it comes to our clearance sales.

"The slowdown I have observed is not felt by us alone but by all of retailers in this industry and we hope that as the year progresses we will see better foot traffic coming through the door. Furthermore I think the global economic slowdown has played a significant role in the

slowing of business for the year," he said. The manager observed that the sluggish growth of the Swaziland economy has definitely filtered down to the real economy, the people, even if they do not have large disposal income they will always put money aside for clothes."Inflationary pressure within in the global economy, in general and the Swazi economy has affected the sales in our busi-

ness," he added.

Chowdhury said, "another poignant issue has been the volatility of the lilangeni, because as you know, these clothes are imported and when doing business, with regards to exports, the US dollar is the currency of exchange."Chowdhury explained that this meant that it is costly to import the products and thus it becomes expensive to the con-

sumer once the price of the clothing item is converted from cost price to sales price.

"This situation exacerbates the problem of sales as now items which we not selling become more expensive. And given the already reluctance of consumers to buy, it becomes even more difficult to sell items which obviously affects our bottom line," he concluded.

Kumba output drops on revised Sishen mine plan

CAPE TOWN - In its production and sales report for the quarter to end-June released yesterday, Kumba Iron Ore [JSE:KIO] announced a production drop of 15% to 8.9 million tonnes, consistent with its revised Sishen mine plan.

Total sales were 9.7 million tonnes (0.8 million tonnes higher than production), a 26% drop as stock levels reduced further. Production and sales volumes referred to are 100% of Sishen Iron Ore Company.

Kumba explained that in order to position the company

to withstand the significant fall in iron ore prices, it revised the Sishen mine plan and reconfigured the pit to a lower cost shell. Implementing the plan had an impact on Sishen's operations and effectively halved mining volumes, resulting in a 31% reduction in the number of permanent employees and contractors. As a result, production for the quarter dropped by 21% to 5.7 million tonnes (2015: 7.2 million

47% to 31 million tonnes. Run rates were affected by the significant restructuring process, which began in the

tonnes) and waste mined by

first quarter and has now been substantially completed.

Run rates were also affected by higher than normal levels of rainfall and safety incidences, including a fatal incident in May.

One person donates R143 000 to SABC 8

JOHANNESBURG - An anonymous person donated over R143 000 (\$10 000) as part of a crowdfunding initiative on website Generosity for SABC journalists who ared for refusing to be censored at the broadcaster.

Over R267 000 has so far been donated via the website after News24 editor Adriaan Basson launched a web page on Generosity dubbed 'Friends of SABC journalists'. (Figures as of 06:45 yesterday.

Basson set an initial target of \$6 000 (R86 000) for the dismissed journalists, but will up this amount after it emerged on Tuesday that four more journalists have been sacked.

The SABC axed Foeta Krige, Suna Venter, Krivani Pillay and Jacques Steenkamp on Monday while Thandeka Gqubule, Busisiwe Ntuli and Lukhanyo Calata were fired on Tuesday.

The eighth person dismissed was freelance journalist Vuvo

The public broadcaster sacked the eight for speaking out against censorship of protest footage at the SABC. News24 reported on Tuesday.

"It's been incredibly humbling to see so many people putting their money where their mouths are for our colleagues ...," Basson wrote in an update on the site.

"In less than 12 hours we have raised more than R240 000 for these 8 brave journalists and friends.

"Soon after the fundraiser was launched, Thandeka, Lukhanyo and Busisiwe were also informed of their sackings by the SABC. Hintendo shares plunge after Pokemon Go doubles its value

TOKYO - Tokyo shares sank yesterday, ending a six-day winning streak, with Nintendo plunging on profittaking after more than doubling this month on the back of the Pokemon Go phenomenon.

The videogame giant slumped almost 13 percent to 27,765 yen, just a day after it overtook Sony in market value, while Japanese fans were left disappointed after a rumoured release in the country yesterday proved wrong.

A gaming website Tuesday had flagged the launch in Nintendo's home market, but it bactracked within a day, saying it would likely come out Thursday, having hit shelves in more than two dozen countries by the weekand.

Nintendo's shares had more than doubled since Pokemon Go's release this month sparked a global frenzy, and boosted hopes for the company's move into mobile gaming.

Nintendo and the Pokemon Company declined to comment on the release date, while US-based Niantic — which developed the garne — has not replied to requests for comment.



Forbes has cited Niantic chief executive John Hanke as saying the reason for the delay is that Japan's server capacity is not powerful enough to keep up with expected demand.

However, McDonald's Japan surged 9.84 percent to 3,515 yen on news it will sponsor Pokemon Go in Japan, according to the Wall Street Journal.

Tokyo's benchmark Nikkei 225 index closed the day 0.25 percent, or 41.42 points, lower at 16,681.89, having surged more than 10 percent over the previous six trading days on the back of an expected government stimulus boost

and a weak yen.

The Japanese unit has lost six percent against the dollar since a strong US jobs report on July 8.

The broader Topix index of all firstsection shares edged down 0.05 percent, or 0.64 points, to 1,330.75.

"Considering there aren't any real catalysts for share moves and that the Nikkei 225 has risen far above its 25day moving average, the market needs a breather," Chihiro Ohta, a senior strategist at SMBC Nikko Securities, told Bloomberg News. "Nintendo shares need a break, too." AFP

Amplats Q2 production increases marginally

JOHANNEBURG - Reports show that Anglo American Platinum's (Amplats) second quarter production yesterday showed a marginal, 1% on than the comparative period in 2015 at 586 000 ounces, with strong operational performances achieved by Union mine and its joint ventures operations, as well as the Unki Platinum Mine in Zimbabwe.

Following significant restructuring at Union mine, Amplats said output at the mine continued to improve thanks to an optimisation plan with production 31% higher at 41 000 ounces, mainly due to improved underground mining efficiencies and increased stability at the concentrator plant.

Amplats released its production report for the second quarter ended June 30.

The world's leading primary producer of platinum group metals said production at Unki increased by 12% to 18 000 ounces for the period due to underground mining efficiencies which resulted in increased milled volume. Joint venture production also increased 9% to 203 000 ounces due to strong production performances from Modikwa, Mototolo, BRPM and Kroondal, which was partly offset by Bokoni.

How some attorneys can turn R500 debt into R10 000

CAPE TOWN - Consumer watchdog Summit Financial Partners is at it again - this time regarding attorneys' fees for collecting bad debts, mostly of micro lenders.

In order to protect consumers, the National Credit Act (NCA) applies the so-called in duplum rule to the collection fees money lenders may claim from debtors.

This rule means interest, fees and costs - including collection costs according to article 101(g) of the NCA - charged on a loan can never be more than the original capital amount involved.

If someone, for instance, borrows R500, then the total interest, fees and costs charged in terms of the loan agreement, cannot be more than an additional R500 in the end.

Domain

"Legal fees are an instruction by a lender to a third party to collect a debt on his behalf, so, in Summit's view, it should fall within the domain of the NCA and very specifically that of section 101(g)," Clark Gardner, CEO of Summit, told Fin24. "Even big banks stick to the in duplum rule regarding debt collecting on money they have lent out."

According to Gardner, Summit intends to approach the high court regarding the application of the in duplum rule on attorneys' collection fees and cots as determined by the NCA when they do debt collecting on a third party's behalf.

"We do not want lawyers to be incentivised to collect on small debts on loans of, for instance R500, on a regular basis," explained Gardner. "Why are debt collectors prescribed a maximum fee they can charge, but attorneys can get thousands of rand from the collection process?"

Summit has selected Steyn Attorneys in Rustenburg as defendant in a case Gardner says Summit intends file at a high court "within the next 30 days or so".

"We believe the regulator and the law makers must protect consumers. We are seeking a court precedent that section 101(g) also relates to attorneys' debt collection fees," said Gardner.

Friedl Kreuser of Summit explained this kind of situation - where a debtor can end up paying more than double his original loan amount - even thousands of rand more - happens when the garnishee process is not properly regulated.

He gives the example of a mine worker who borrowed R500 from a credit provider and who has R1 165 deducted from his pay slip every month in terms of a garnishee order. He has already paid R6 751 to Steyn Attorneys - and apparently still owes another R4 117. Fin24

Inflation hits 6.3% as prices rise across the board

JOHANNESBURG - Prices increased on average by 0.6% between May 2016 and June 2016, according to data released by Statistics South Africa yesterday.

The annual consumer price inflation for June 2016 was 6.3%. This is up from 6.1% reported in May 2016.

Prices rose across the board. Food and non-alcoholic beverages lifted from 1.6% in the previous month to 1.7%. The index increased by 10.8% from the previous year.

Housing and utilities were up to 0.2%. The increase in transport to 0.2% was mostly due to the 52 cents per litre increase in the petrol price and a 5.1% hike in air fares, the report stated.

In June the consumer price index (CPI) for goods increased by 6.7% from the previous year, up from 6.6% reported in May. This increase is higher than the current 6.1% inflation rate. The CPI for services increased by 5.8% from the previous year, up from 5.7% in May. Fin24

New low cost airline Fly Blue Crane launches

JOHANNESBURG - A new low cost airline is taking to the skies.

From the first of October Fly Blue Crane will offer flights between Johannesburg and Mthatha.

The airline says it will initially offer only two flights a day between Mthatha and Johannesburg, Other routes will be added to connect the former Transkei capital to other major cities. The Eastern Cape government says it hopes that cheaper flights will result in less road accidents. The route is being offered for less than R800 a flight. Fly Blue Crane says unlike other low-cost airlines, it will provide free meals and beverages on board. eNCA

ANC alarmed as another two Councillor candidates murdered

KWAZULU-NATAL - The African National Congress in KwaZulu-Natal has raised alarm bells following the killing of another two of its councillor candidates, ahead of August's local government elections.

The party in the province said KwaZulu-Natal needed economic growth and sustainable development, and neither of those could be achieved in an atmosphere marked by politically motivated killings on the eve of an election.

It claimed that the murders were part of a "well-orchestrated campaign to cull the party's candidates".

A total of 13 ANC leaders and members have been killed in the province in the past four months.

In the past, the party has been loathe to admit to the political motive. It merely called on law enforcement agencies to investigate and provide better security ahead of the August 3 polls.



But the rising death toll seems to be forcing a change of approach.

On Monday, ward councillor candidate in Umuziwabantu Municipality Bongani Skhosana was shot dead in front of a group of children he was transporting to school.

Another candidate, Khanyisile Ngobese-Sibisi, was shot and killed in Ladysmith on her way to a Nelson Mandela Day event.

The ANC in the province said a number of its members had also received death threats.

In June, Police Minister Nathi Nhleko established a task team to investigate killings believed to be politically motivated, after the ANC in KwaZulu-Natal called on police to escalate its investigations.

ANC Provincial Spokesperson

Mdumiseni Ntuli on Monday said the party had not received any reports from the police or feedback on the task team.

Hawks Spokesperson Brig Hangwani Mulaudzi said on Tuesday: "The task team is investigating the matter, so far no breakthrough."

The ANC's Secretary in KwaZulu-Natal, Super Zuma, has now called for a commission of inquiry to be established into the killings. Apart from national government, the Premier, Willies Mchunu, could also consider taking such action.

"As the ANC we are concerned about the slow progress in apprehending the perpetrators and in identifying the dark forces that apparently stand behind this carnage," said Zuma.

"The ANC is also calling for an urgent meeting with the provincial and national ministers of safety and security to deal with these killings." timeslive

Authorities working on repatriating Gugu Zulu's remains

JOHANNESBURG - The Nelson Mandela Foundation (NMF), the South African government and their Tanzanian counterparts were working closely together to bring racing driver Gugu Zulu's body home, the foundation said on Tuesday.

"All the trekkers returning from the summit are safe and were informed of the passing of Gugu.

They were devastated by the news," the NMF said.

"They are currently making their way down the mountain and [will] return to South Africa on Wednesday. We can't confirm at this stage if [his wife] Letshego Zulu will return on the same flight."

NMF said they are awaiting documentation from Tanzanian authorities and South Africa's home affairs before travel arrangements can be made [for Gugu]. Hoping

"We are hoping to resolve these issues by Tuesday before flight details can be confirmed."

Sello Hatang, the Chief Executive Officer of the foundation, is in Tanzania with Letshego.

The couple were part of 'Trek4Mandela' climbing Mount Kilimanjaro for a charity expedition to benefit schoolgirls.

The NFM said the 'Trek4Mandela' climbers were expected to arrive at OR Tambo International Airport last night. The expedition was led by experienced mountaineer, Sibusiso Vilane.

Zulu, a veteran racing driver and television presenter affectionately known as 'the fastest brother in Africa,' died after experiencing breathing problems while climbing Mount Kilimanjaro.

Govt launches self-service medicine 'ATMs'

PIETERMARITZBURG - South Africans will soon obtain their medication from self-service ATM-style machines.

This was announced by the South African ministry of health on Tuesday at the International AIDS Conference taking place this week in Durban.

In a statement from the Department of Health, they said the Pharmacy Dispensing Unit (PDU), currently being piloted at Thembalethu Clinic in Johannesburg, is a self-service machine where patients can obtain their medication in the same way people withdraw money at an ATM.

"To use the machine, all a patient needs to do is register for the service, after which they receive a card that's similar to a bank card. To 'withdraw' their medication, users simply insert their card into the PDU machine, enter their PIN and select the medication they require from their prescription list. The machine immediately dispenses the selected medication, eliminating the need for the patient to wait in queues," the statement said.

The PDU also allows patients to communicate directly with a trained pharmacist from the machine using a built-in video

conferencing function.
Addressing the delegates at the conference, Minister of Health Dr Aaron
Motsoaledi said SA is running the biggest
HIV treatment programme in the world. In three decades the number of patients on treatment has increased from 400 000 to over 3.4 million. "However, the number of healthcare workers has not kept up with this increase, often leading to frustrated patients and lack of treatment adherence.

And the latest means of transport to be given the autonomous treatment is a public bus.

Mercedes-Benz has revealed its self-driving future Bus', which it says will be the 'local subjectionsport of the future'.

The door arrangement has been designed to speed up passenger flows, with two double doors illuminated to show an Exit door (red) and and Entrance door (green).

In terms of the bus' interior, 'it takes its lead from public spaces such as squares and parks, and has nothing in common with the usual appearance of a city bus', according to Daimler.

The bus will be divided into three zones - a 'service zone' at the front, an 'express zone' in the middle for passengers travelling short distances, and a 'lounge zone' at the back for those staying on for a longer stay.

Despite the three zones which somewhat divide the area up, the bus appears to be very open plan and spacious. The bus' first driverless journey was in the Netherlands, where it was put to the test with numerous bends and passes through tunnels and junctions with traffic lights.

Despite the challenge, the bus performed well, with a top speed of 43 miles/hour (70 km/hour).

Mercedes-Benz and City Pilot together hope that their new bus will improve the level of transport safety and relieve driver workloads.



IMF forecasts Nigeria's economy

LAGOS - Nigeria's economy, the biggest in Africa, is likely to contract by 1.8 percent this year, the International Monetary Fund (IMF) said on Tuesday, as the country grapples with the impact of low oil prices. The sharp fall in global prices since 2014 has led to a prolonged economic crisis since the crude sales make up around 70 percent of government revenue. The IMF's projection for this year, contained in its World Economic Outlook update, is down from the 2.3 percent growth it foresaw in its April forecast. Reuters

Ten die in ethnic violence in DR Congo's troubled east

GOMA - Ten civilians died in the Democratic Republic of Congo's volatile east in ethnic violence, an army spokesman said Tuesday, adding that the military had intervened to restore order.

"We denounce the killing of 10 civilians and huts being torched," said Captain Guillaume Djike, adding that the violence broke out overnight in Kibirizi, about 150 kilometres (90 miles) southwest of Goma, the main city of the troubled Nord Kivu province.

Gaston Kakule, a prominent resident of the area, blamed rebels from the Democratic Forces for the Liberation of Rwanda (FDLR), which is active in the area, of staging the attack.

Kakule said all those killed belonged to the Nande ethnic



group, referring to a local tribe. "The army intervened and reestablished order," army spokesman Djike said.

Dozens of people have been killed in the region in clashes between the Nandes and Congolese Hutus, whom the

locals accuse of backing the Rwandan rebels.


The FDLR was set up by Rwandan Hutu refugees in eastern DR Congo after the 1994 genocide in their country which claimed 800,000 lives.

The group is accused of target-

ing moderate Hutus as well as people from the Tutsi minority and are regularly blamed for serious human rights violations against civilians in eastern DR Congo.

The Congolese army last February announced a broad offensive against the FDLR, not just in Nord Kivu, but also in Sud Kivu and the northern part of Katanga province in a bid to sweep them clear of national ter-

The Rwandan government, however, accuses the Congolese authorities of doing nothing to tackle the rebels, whom Kigali presents as a major strategic threat even though the FDLR has not launched a big offensive on Rwandan soil in years.

Egypt nominates ex-minister for top UNESCO job

CAIRO - Egypt announced Tuesday it is nominating former minister and Ambassador Moushira Khattab for the post of UNESCO director general.

A former ambassador to South Africa, the Czech Republic and Slovakia, Khattab was family and population minister between 2009 and 2011 under now-deposed president Hosni Mubarak.

She also served as secretary general of the National Council for Childhood and Motherhood in Egypt.

"Egypt will nominate Ambassador Moushira Khattab for

director general of UNESCO." said a statement from the office of Prime Minister Ismail Sharif.

The mandate of UNESCO's current director general, Irina Bokova of Bulgaria, expires in 2017.

Bokova is among the candidates to succeed UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon, whose mandate runs out this year.

She was elected head of the Paris-based UNESCO in 2009, becoming the first woman to lead the UN agency. She was re-elected in 2013 for a second four-year

'Lock her up,' shout Republicans denouncing Clinton

CLEVELAND - Republican delegates enaged Hillary Clinton on Tuesday by breaking into angry chants of "lock her up" and "guilty" as New Jersey Governor Chris Christie laid out a criminal-style case against her.

While the FBI stopped short of recommending charges against the presumptive Democratic nominee over her email scandal, Christie, himself a former federal proscutor went into attack-dog mode on the second day of the Republican National Convention in Cleveland.

"Let's do something fun tonight," he said. "We are going to present the facts to you. You, tonight, sitting as a jury of her peers in this hall and in your living rooms around our nation," he said.

He then outlined what he called "the facts" against Clinton, savaging her record as US secretary of state, holding her responsible for the chaos and violence engulfing Libya, and asking whether she is guilty or not guilty" of being an apologist for Boko Haram in Nigeria.

"As an awful judge of the character of a dictator and butcher in the Middle East, is she guilty or not guilty?" he shouted in refgence to Syrian President Bashar al-Assad. AFP

JAPAN - Tokyo was struck by a third quake in four days yesterday, but there were no reports of damage or casualties. The 5.0 magnitude jolt struck Tokyo and areas of eastern Japan at 7:25 am (2225 GMT Tuesday), the US Geological Survey

The quake's epicentre was east of the capital in Ibaraki at a depth of about 44 kilometres (27 miles), the USGS said.

French PM warns there will be more deadly attacks

PARIS - French Prime Minister Manuel Valls warned on Tuesday that the country must be prepared for more deadly attacks and will have to "learn to live with the threat".

His warning came after President François Hollande said he was willing to extend France's state of emergency for another six months following the Bastille Day massacre in Nice in which 84 people were killed.

"Even if these words are hard to say, it's my duty to do so: There will be other attacks and there will be other innocent people killed." Valls told French lawmakers.

"We must not become accustomed to, but learn to live with, this threat," the prime minister added.

Valls also said suspected islamist Reda Kriket, arrested

near Paris in March with an arsenal of weapons, had "surely" been planning to target the Euro 2016 football tournament in France, which wrapped up without an attack just over a week ago.

Hollande had only last Thursday announced a planned lifting of the emergency security measures -

which give the police extra powers to carry out searches and place people under house arrest - originally imposed after the Paris attacks that killed 130 people last November.

French MPs will now mull a fourth extension of the eight-month-old state of emergency, as criticism mounts of the Socialist government's response to a slew of extremist attacks.

The Paris prosecutor's office said on Tuesday that all the victims of the Nice massacre had finally been identified. Around 30 were Muslims, said an official from a regional representative body, and almost half were foreigners.

Five days after the attack, 70 people remain hospitalised, 19 in critical condition.

'No retreat from US pivot to Asia-Pacific'

SYDNEY - US Vice Clinton. President Joe Biden yesterday assured key ally Australia there would be no retreat from Washington's pivot to the Asia-Pacific region regardless of who wins November's presidential election.

Biden dismissed concerns that Republican presidential nominee Donald Trump would abandon President Barack Obama's strategy for the Asia-Pacific if he were to defeat Democratic nominee Hillary

"The United States is all in. We've made good on that promise and continue to make good on that promise. We have shown our commitment to lead the region over and over again."

Tensions between the US and China have been rising in recent months over the South China Sea, through which more than \$5-trillion (R71 64trillion) in trade passes every year.

Biden's visit to the region

follows last week's court ruling in The Hague that China has no historic title over the disputed waters.

Beijing has dismissed the case, brought by the Philippines, as a farce and accused Washington of fuelling tensions.

Neither Trump nor Clinton have been vocal supporters of Obama's Asia-Pacific pivot in their campaigning, leading some to question Washington's support for the strategy. AFP

Italy plucks 3 200 migrants

ROME - More than 3 200 migrants were rescued from the Mediterranean on Tuesday in 25 operations, the Italian coastguard said. One person was found dead during the rescue efforts, said the coastguard yesterday, which co-ordinated the missions conducted by the Italian navy and coastguard, the EU's Eunavfor Med mission and NGOs such as MSF, Sea Watch and MOAS. The latest arrivals take the number of migrants to have landed in Italy this year to more than 80,000, according to the UN's refugee agency.

Canada pledges \$158m to Iraq

OTTAWA - The Canadian government promised Tuesday to send 158 million dollars (US\$121 million) in humanitarian assistance to Iraq, along with up to 200 million dollars in loan guarantees. Nearly all of the humanitarian funds will go toward supporting "the international humanitarian response to help meet the basic needs of conflict-affected Iraqis," said Canadian Minister of International Development Marie-Claude Bibeau. AFP

Brazil investigates Olympic threats

BRASILIA - Brazil's intelligence agency said on Tuesday it was investigating all threats to next month's

Rio Olympics after a presumed Brazilian Islamist group pledged allegiance to Islamic State (IS) less than



three weeks before the Games. The SITE Intelligence Group that monitors the internet reported that a group calling itself 'Ansar al-Khilafah Brazil' said on the Telegram messaging app on Sunday that it followed IS leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi and had promoted IS propaganda in Arabic, English and Portuguese. Reuters

'We are going to win the presidency'

CLEVELAND - Donald Trump told the Republican National Convention on Tuesday that he would win the White House in November, saying he was "so proud" to be their nominee for US president. "This is a movement. But we have to go all the way. I am so proud to be your nominee for president," he told delegates by video link. The New York billionaire, who has never previously held public office, said it had been "a very special day" to watch his adult children declare New York's delegate count that put him over the top. AFP

Florida probes Zika transmission

FLORIDA - Florida health officials said on Tuesday they are investigating a case of Zika virus infection that does not appear to have stemmed from travel to another region with an outbreak. The statement from the Florida Department of Health did not specify whether the Zika case was believed to have been transmitted via mosquito bite, sexual contact or other means. The department said the case was reported in Miami-Dade County and that it is working with the US Centres for Disease Control and Prevention on an epidemiological study. Reuters





She has been constantly posting status updates that invite fans to head down Malagwane on July 30 for the event that starts at 10:00am.


Mandy ecstatically said "I am going

The FA Cup triumph in Van Gaal's last game was United's only trophy since Sir Alex Ferguson retired after winning the Premier League title in 2013, but Rooney believes Mourinho can bring back the glory days after signing Zlatan

Ibrahimovic (Paris Saint-Germain), Eric Bailly (Villarreal) and Henrikh Mkhitaryan

(Borussia Dortmund) this summer. United are also hotly pursuing Juventus midfielder Paul Pogba.

"I'm excited," added Rooney, who struck just 15 goals for the Old Trafford club in all competitions last campaign. 'I think it's going to be a big season for us.

Hopefully we can have a good start to the season and be successful at the end of it.

"I've only had one day (with him) before we came out but it was a very good training session. Look at the teams he has been at before and the success he's had. We're hoping he can bring in that success to us.

Demba Ba insists he will not hang up his boots


BELJING - Ex-Chelsea striker Demba Ba has no intention of retiring early from football despite suffering a horrific leg break.



Premier League to get tough on players

LONDON - Premier League stars have been warned they must show more respect to rel erees in a wide-ranging clamp down on petulant behaviour ahead of the new season.

Frustrated by the growing trend for players to harass officials with foul-mouth abuse and aggressive posturing, the Football Association, the Premier League and the Football League announced they have joined forces in a bid to stamp out the

The English game's governing bodies are concerned that scenes

of players and managers surrounding match officials, making physical contact and velling abuse are being copied by children in age-group football. Incidents which underlined the need for a new hardline approach include Leicester striker Jamie Vardy abusing referee Jonathan Moss after being controversially sent off for diving against West Ham in April and the series of brawls that marred Tottenham's crucial draw at Chelsea and led to big fines for both clubs.

"That (Chelsea game) wasn't a trigger for this but it underscored a good reason why we needed to get a move on," FA chief execu-

"We are saying this behavioural stuff, which is pretty black and white, isn't acceptable.

"The one thing that would make people love football more is a set of behaviours they would be proud to see their kids follow."

From the start of this season, players who use offensive language towards officials will be punished with a red card, while aggressive physical contact will also earn an instant sending off.

Steve Walsh new **Everton director** of football

LONDON - Everton have completed a deal to make Steve Walsh their new director of football after coming to an agreement with Leicester City to secure his release.





NFAS VIOLATING ITS OWN STATUTES, SAYS MASHUMI

SOCCER – SUSPENDED National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) executive committee member Mashumi Shongwe has accused the association of violating its own statutes when appointing the SRFA interim committee.

This is contained in his founding affidavit filed at the High Court. In his papers, Shongwe said the conduct by the NFAS in this regard was unlawful and irregular because both statutes of the Shiselweni Regional Football Association (SRFA) and the NFAS do not provide for an interim committee without invoking Article 24 as there is no such structure.

He stated that, as such, the football association had replaced a lawful structure with a non-existent and unconstitutional structure in a way that is unconstitutional and contrary to the statutes of the parties.

Shongwe said the football association had no power to charge and suspend the applicants because they were not in office at the time of the alleged defiance.

Powers

"I wish to state that, in suspending the past executive committee of the SRFA and all the applicants, the NFAS acted ultra vires its powers set out in its statues as it has no authority over the past or former executive

"In purporting to put in place an interim committee, the football association acted against its own statutes. It exercised powers it does not have in law," reads part of the papers. Shongwe further stated that the powers of the FA as stated in Article 36(t) of its Statutes only authorise the NFAS executive committee to enact a normalisation committee and not an interim committee.

"The FA has powers to order an association to elect an interim committee and not to elect or impose an interim committee on the association," he said.



The two were part of the committee appointed by NFAS Vice President Nichodemus 'Ace' Mashwama and executive committee member Johannes Siboza during an urgent meeting convened by the FA last Sunday.

Shongwe, through his attorneys from Mandla Mkhwanazi law firm, said the interim committee led by Mamba and Dube was not elected by the SRFA but was imposed by the FA.

"The two respondents have no right to occupy the positions they assumed illegally and in contravention of the FA's own statutes," he said.

Meanwhile, the NFAS has filed a notice of intention to oppose the application by Shongwe in this matter.

"He was a very good player, a very good finisher and also good on set pieces. We liked him a lot in terms of his technique but we felt we need a number 10 that was a little bit quicker.

"A number 10 that will break lines a lot because we've got a specimen of Khama Billiat," Mngqithi told KickOff.com.

"So we want to get someone that can always bring that dimension of the game from a number 10 position and unfortunately he's not one of the quickest players and he does not assist us much in our pressing game defensively."

Mngqithi is certain that at a smaller PSL clubs, Badenhorst will have the requisite skills to make it.

"If I was still coaching a small club like Golden Arrows, I would have signed him to play as a defensive midfielder. He's got the right physical attributes and technique and his speed is not any issue in that position," Mngqithi c

cludes. Trying

Meanwhile, Felix and his Swallows teammate in striker Sabelo 'Sikhali' Ndzinisa are now trying out with South African outfit Bloemfontein Celtics and are likely to sign on the dotted line for the side if they impress.

The players left on Sunday after the national team Sihlangu party held at the National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) Technical Centre two weeks ago. The Swallows attacking midfielder 'Fela', who had been linked with a move to Soweto giants Kaizer Chiefs, attracted a number of South African teams, especially after his impressive run in the recently ended COSAFA Castle Cup held in Windhoek, Namibia, where he walked away with the Golden Boot award after netting five goals during the tournament.

Scooped

He also scooped two Man of the Match awards during the regional showpiece where the country came back with their first ever bronze medal.

Last month, KickOff.com reported that Free State Stars were also interested in the 27-year-old but a source at Ea Lla Koto said the club has lost the battle to sign the player to Chiefs. Badenhorst had a stellar COSAFA Cup, propelling the Swazi national team to a third-place finish. He also had a one-week trial at Mamelodi Sundowns in December last year, which was unsuccessful.
