Education minister blasted over E5m broken promise

MINISTER for Education and Training Phineas Magagula came under serious attack yesterday for not honouring the promise he made to SCU.

Magagula has been accused of not walking the talk as he promised to give E5 million in this financial year to Swaziland Christian University (SCU), something that did not happen.

This did not go down well with the lawmakers. They took turns in blasting the minister for reducing himself to a person who liked blabbering.

This was during the tabling of the first quarter performance report by the minister before members of his ministry's portfolio committee, which then debated it. The portfolio committee is chaired by Hosea MP Thulani Masuku.

Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe urged Magagula to write a letter of apology to the Korean sponsors who came here to build a university, with an intention of improving the education of the country.

Shongwe went on to present a document, which he said was signed by Ministry of Education and Training Principal Secretary (PS) Pat Muir.

"In this document, the ministry promised to give E27 million for five years. Up to this minute, this has never happened. I now want to take this message to the King to find out if this was the right thing to do for the ministry," Shongwe said.

The legislator went on to say if a certain amount of power had not been taken away from Parliament, drastic actions would be taken to correct this matter. "Kube lephalamende lena ayiphakulwanga, kukhona bekufanele kwenteke. Utangiva ke lova SiSwati kutsi ngitsini," he said in SiSwati.

Shiselweni II MP Mthokozisi Masuku also complained of what was happening at SCU. He said this was one of the things that decreased the standard of education in the country.

He said something should be done to correct the situation. The same thing was raised by Hosea

MP Thulani Masuku. He wanted to know when the situation would be resolved at SCU.

Mtsambama MP Richard Simelane wondered if the proposed transition of William Pitcher Teacher Training College and Ngwane Teacher College to a university would be successful.

"If we fail to take care of the universities we have right now, I doubt if we will be able to take care of these universities we are proposing," he said.

In response, Magagula said he would not be able to write the letter because his ministry did not even know of any donors.

"We were only informed of donors who had come to work in the country, but we were never involved in any dealings with

"I do not know why I would write the letter," Magagula said.

He said on the E27 million issue, there was an addendum that stated that the E27 million would only be given if it was available. The minister then said there were many issues they had to iron out first with SCU before their relationship could be smooth.

Home Affairs worst performer, angry MPs wash their hands THE continued poor performance

by the ministry of home affairs has greatly disappointed members of parliament. The legislators told Minister Princess

Tsandzile they had run out of ideas on what to do in order for the ministry to provide service to the masses as required. Ngwempisi MP Veli Shongwe said he was so angry he was unable even to express himself.

He said, however, he would try to calm down so that he could express his frustration at the hands of the ministry. Shongwe said the ministry did not involve them in its activities, yet at the end of the day people at the grassroots level demanded answers from them as their official representatives.

He said the ministry organised several national events which needed people to participate but failed to inform them. Nkwene MP Sikhumbuzo Dlamini concurred with Shongwe. He said in one of these events people from his constituency were stranded without transport to ferry them home.

He said they telephoned him at midnight and accused him of being unhelpful, yet he was not involved at the early stages of the event planning.

He said he had to in turn call the minister who, fortunately, was able to organise transport for the stranded Nkwene residents. He did not mention the national event they were attending.

Mhlume MP Sifiso Magagula said he was also very disappointed with the

way the ministry performed.

He said the immigration department was the worst performer. Magagula said he was surprised that the ministry made no mention of its negotiations with South Africa on the extension of operating hours for Mananga border gate. He said that border gate was so busy it deserved to be opened 24 hours a day. The minister's response was that the extension of opening hours was a ter that the Swaziland government not decide on and conclude all by itself.

She said the Republic of South Africa was supposed to agree on the proposed arrangements, adding that they had been negotiating with them for many years without success.



MP Veli Shongwe asked Home Affairs Minister Princess Tsandzile why a truck that was purchased for more than E2 million was lying idle at the ministry.

Shongwe said the truck was meant to bring the ministry's services closer to the people but that was not happening anymore, despite the wild outcry in the rural communities for services.

"There is no quality service delivery to the people and the truck has become very useless," said Shongwe angrily. He said those who were in need of the civil registration services always approached them demanding answers.

When they try to drive them to the ministry to seek assistance, he said,

they were turned away. His main concern was that the ministry frustrated even orphaned and vulnerable children by refusing them basic services such as birth certificates and national identities. He said they did so by demanding unreasonable witnesses, sometimes long departed parents of the children.

Shongwe further alleged that there was a South African farmer who was freely crossing into both Swaziland and South Africa without using any formal entry point.

Shongwe said the farmer around Ngwempisi area owned a farm that extends into the country. He said he grows vegetables and has the sole right to cross into Swaziland anytime he felt

like without stamping his passport while Swazis were harassed for using the informal settlements. He challenged the minister to explain the arrangement the farmer had with the immigration department if at all there was any.

SWAZILAND UNDER SIEGE **ASIANS**

WITH the continued influx of Asians into the country, coupled with a looming religious war, Nhlambeni MP Frans Dlamini said the country was now under siege.

Dlamini said the government, through the ministry of home affairs must act on the matter fast and decisively to prevent the imminent catastrophe. "What is the ministry doing to calm the situation? asked MP Dlamini.

He said of greater concern to him was that some of these religious groups were known not to be tolerant, so much so that they could harm those opposed to them. He said already Bishop Steven Masilela was leading a faction of Christians under the Council of Swaziland Churches, warning his followers not to participate in the recently announced public feasting by the other religious group.

Occupying

Dlamini warned that in a few years' time more Asians would be occupying the legislature.

The Nhlambeni MP also dianted to 10 know what would happen to the Aslan's who had already been granted Swazi 9 citizenship yet they entered the country illegally in the first place. 3b yhs9

The minister said it was possible to to

withdraw the citizenship from anyone once it was established that he obtained it through fraudulent means.

Mtfongwaneni MP Mjuluko Dlamini said, there was a need to reconsider the decision the country took to allow the freedom of religions.

Dlamini asked the minister if the Christian religious leaders were acting at the ministry's instruction to inform Christians not to eat the meat that was provided by the other religion.

The minister said her ministry was never involved in the matter and that the church leaders were doing so on their own.

Why Chief Immigration Officer not appointed

MP Mjuluko Dlamini asked the minister to explain why he was not appointing a chief immigration officer since the position had remained vacant for too long.

Dlamini said all the concerns by the MP regarding the immigration department should have been taken up by the chief immigration officer. Dlamini said the ministry has now established what he termed a Friday Committee, which he said had assumed the responsibilities of the chief immigration officer.

He asked the minister if this committee had

been gazetted and how much power was vested

The minister's response was that the position of chief immigration officer had been given a lower grade and they were now in the process of improving the position's grade.

Dlamini said what was even shocking was that government was failing to repatriate those they had been found to be in the country illegally.

BOGUS' TEACHER STEALS E1 MILLION FROM GOVT

THE police fraud and commercial crime unit arrested a teacher for allegedly siphoning over E1 million from the Teaching Service Commission (TSC).

Thabisile Nokwazi Tsela, aged 52 years, from Etjebovu Primary School near Mankayane was arrested by the Mbabane Police and charged with fraud for the offence she allegedly committed in 1994 when she was hired by the TSC as a teacher.

It has been alleged that she submitted a forged O'level certificate to government when she applied to beb O'level certificate to government when she applied to be hired as a teacher in 1994. She subsequently made government pay her salary from that time until August 2016, when she knew that the certificate she had submitted was not authentic, it was alleged

hired as a teacher in 1994.

She subsequently made government to pay her salaries from that time until August 2016, when she knew that the certificate she had submitted was not authentic, it was alleged.

It was said, in the charge sheet, that she induced the TSC to a loss and prejudice of E1 081 8871.97 in the form of salaries, due to the said misrepresentation.

She was arrested on September 15, 2016 and made her first appearance

before the Mbabane Magistrate's court on the following day where she was remanded into custody.

She was kept at the Sidvwashini Correctional Facility pending committal to the High court for trial.

She yesterday instructed her attorney Sabelo 'Chicken' Dlamini from NMK Attorneys to file an urgent bail application before the High court. In her affidavit, she stated that she is a single parent of five children, three of whom were minors and one a schol-

ar.

"My continued incarceration will not only be detrimental to my job, but also to the well being of my entire family and my future. I am advised and verily believe that all issues sanctioning a person's liberty are by their nature urgent, in particular because I am presently gainfully employed as a teacher since 1994," she said.

She undertook not to evade trial

once freed on bail since she only has one place of abode, being Ntondozi in the Manzini region.

She also submitted that the police had already finalised investigations on the matters, therefore, her released would not jeopardise their work.

The matter was before Principal High Court Judge Stanley Maphalala and the office of the director of public prosecutions did not oppose the application to be admitted to bail. Bail, was by consent of the two parties, fixed at E50 000.

Tsela was ordered to pay E3 000 cash and provide surety to the value of E47 000. She was directed to report to the police on a monthly basis and surrender her passport to the investigating officer.

She was warned against applying for another passport or leaving the country pending finalisation of her criminal trial, unless she has been granted permission by the court.

TB places SD at top high burdened countries

TUBERCULOSIS (TB) has placed the country at the top high burdened countries in the world.

This has been revealed in the ministry of health first quarter budget performance report tabled in parliament.

The report states that Swaziland's current estimates of tuberculosis prevalence are 605/100 000 population, placing the country at the top high burdened countries in the world.

It states that estimated incidence is currently at 733/100 000, and estimated TB-related mortality (excluding HIV) has stabilised at approximately 51/100 000 population over the decade.

"The TB/HIV co-infection rate among incident TB case has remained above 80 percent and equally challenging is the increasing burden of drug-resistant TB in the country," it is stated in the report.

The report further reveals that TB detection baseline is at 38 percent, while the target is 80 percent and between April and June they were at 60 percent. It however states that the treatment success rate's baseline is at 79 percent and the target was 78 percent while between April and June the treatment rate was at 81 percent.

The report further states that the ministry has introduced TB active case finding program.

"There is active case finding project which aims at conducting proactive door to door TB screening in communities.

The focus of this project is to identify TB index cases at health facilities then actively conduct contact tracing whereby all contacts will be screened for TB and ultimately linked to care if they screen positive and diagnosed with TB. Under this project a total of 369 Active Case Finders were trained and regional and national coordinator were recruited to oversee the whole

project.

ABOUT TUBERCULOSIS

Tuberculosis (TB) is an infectious disease caused by the bacterium Mycobacterium tuberculosis (MTB).

Tuberculosis generally affects the lungs, but can also affect other parts of the body. Most infections do not have symptoms, known as latent tuberculosis. About 10 percent of latent infections progress to active disease which, if left untreated, kills about half of those infected. The classic symptoms of active TB are a chronic cough with blood-containingsputum, fever, night sweats, and weight loss.] The historical term "consumption" came about due to the weight loss. Infection of other organs can cause a wide range of symptoms.

Tuberculosis is spread through the air when people who have active TB in their lungs cough, spit, speak, or sneeze. People with latent TB do not spread the disease. Active infection occurs more often in people with HIV/AIDS and in those who smoke. Diagnosis of active TB is based on chest X-rays, as well as microscopic examination and culture of body fluids.

Diagnosis of latent TB relies on the tuberculin skin test (TST) or blood tests. Prevention of TB involves screening those at high risk, early detection and treatment of cabes, and vaccination with the bacillus Calmette-Guérin vaccine. Those at high risk include household, workplace, and social contacts of people with active TB. Treatment requires the use of multiple antibiotics over a long period

of time. Antibiotic resistance is a growing problem with increasing rates of multiple drug-resistant tuberculosis (MDR-TB). Tuberculosis may infect any part of the body, but most commonly occurs in the lungs (known as pulmonary tuberculosis). Extrapulmonary TB occurs when tuberculosis develops outside of the lungs, although extrapulmonary TB may coexist with pulmonary TB. General signs and symptoms include fever, chills, night sweats, loss of appetite, weight loss, and fatique. Significant nail clubbing may also occur.

CAUSES

The main cause of TB is Mycobacterium tuberculosis, a small, aerobic, nonmotilebacillus. The high lipid content of this pathogen accounts for many of its unique clinical characteristics. It divides every 16 to 20 hours, which is an extremely slow rate compared with other bacteria, which usually divide in less than an hour. Mycobacteria have an outer membrane lipid bilayer. If a Gram stain is performed, MTB either stains very weakly

either stains very weakly
"Gram-positive" or does not
retain dye as a result of the
high lipid and mycolic acid
content of its cell wall. MTB
can withstand weak disinfectants and survive in a dry state
for weeks.

In nature, the bacterium can grow only within the cells of a host organism, but M. tuberculosis can be cultured in the laboratory.

2 Mozambicans fines E500 each for peeing in town

TWO Mozambican nationals learnt the hard way that peeing in town is unlawful after they were each fined E500.

Following their arrest for peeing behind the shelters at the Mbabane bus rank, Albert Ntsinini and Tito Mhlanga shifted the blame to one police officer they called Xaba.

They accused him of hating them for no apparent reason while adding that their arrest was organised by him just to spite them.

However, that did little to save them as the Swazi National Court ordered the police officer leading evidence to be removed and asked for the security guards to replace him as they are the ones who caught the culprits red-handed. Actually, the accused persons who displayed a rebellious attitude after making it clear that there was a personal agenda against them with the police, made their first appearance in court on Monday but had to be turned back after the court asked for the security guards to lead evidence instead of the police officer. It is said the two refused to pay the E60 fine they were initially ordered hence the matter escalated to the court.

"I would like to know where was the police officer when we allegedly urinated at the bus rank as only the security guards approached us," Ntsinini said.

Court President Chief Lembelele sentenced the two to a fine of seven months in jail or pay E500 to gain their liberation.

FEES MUST FALL PROTESTS -

Wits Campus students Stone the Great Hall

JOHANNESBURG Protests took a turn for the
worse on Wits campus yesterday afternoon, when a
number of students threw
rocks and stones at security
guards on the steps of the
Great Hall.

The Wits University student protest over fees spread from the main campus yesterday morning as police fired stun grenades at protesters.

Students marched from the Braamfontein campus to the education and medical campuses in Parktown.

The university has decided not to suspend its academic programme, despite hundreds of students protesting. It says protesting students will be arrested if they do not comply with orders from police and security personnel.

At least 31 people were arrested on the morning when a group of protesters blocked entrances to the Braamfontein

campus, but were later released on a warning. The students are demanding that fees not be increased next year.

Sweltering

Through the sweltering
Pietermaritzburg heat, blind
student Sandile Madlala stood

marched in protest over a

KwaZulu-Natal fee increase.

The students, roused by the chorus of struggle songs, amassed outside

Pietermaritzburg's provincial legislature to demand free education. This after the announcement by Higher **Education and Training** Minister Blade Nzimande that tertiary institutions could hike their 2017 fees by up to eight percent for those who could afford it. Students who qualify for NSFAS or whose families earn above the NSFAS threshold, but who are unable to support their children to access higher education, will experience no fee increase in 2017. eNCA

NMMU CLOSED AFTER STUDENTS PROTEST

PORT ELIZABETH – Students at the Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University protested at the main entrance yesterday.

They blocked the entrance at a traffic circle on University Way in Summerstrand.

The SRC said it would shutdown the institution together with students, to protest the 2017 fee increase announced by Higher Education Minister, Blade Nzimande.

The South African government insists that "well-off" families will have to cough up for the increase in fees for 2017, which Nzimande capped at eight percent.

On Monday, the minister announced tertiary education institutions across South Africa

were now permitted to individually determine the level of their 2017 fees increase.

In a statement, the NMMU SRC said some of the immediate issues that needed to be addressed, included students who were granted down-payment must be cleared of their debt, and given allowances.

"The students have expressed the fact that what the minister has announced does not address the problems our students are facing, we all agreed that the poor and missing middle are systematically excluded through the lack of funding. We will only be liberated through free quality education for the poor."

Several students held placards demanding free education in their life time, some screaming that police were attacking them while they fought for their rights.

education," one yelled. Students told journalists that police had said they would allow them to walk to different campuses, but met them with force earlier and were fearing the same would happen if they tried to return to their main campus. News24



Confusion as two financial statements presented

THERE was some confusion during the Municipal Council of Mbabane annual general meeting when two different sets of financial statements were presented.

The confusion came to the fore

during a question and answer session, where prominent businessman Walter Bennett asked a question as to which financial statements were being discussed at the AGM as he was in possession of different sets of these.

"I am not sure which financial account you are speaking of as there seems to be two different sets of

financials for the Council. I have one in my possession that is different from the one which has been presented here today," Bennett said.

Municipal Council of Mbabane Mayor Benito Jones, in response said, "the financials that have been presented here today are the ones in the annual report, which are an extract, or rather have been extract-

ed from the comprehensive financial document which you speak of.

What you have are the detailed comprehensive results that appear in that document and the one that are being tabled here today are the same." At that point the mayor asked Bennett to sit down and give others a chance to pose questions. Dalriach East resident, Sipho Dlamini asked why there were two financial reports. "Please kindly furnish me with the comprehensive financial statements as they are more detailed than the ones being tabled here today," he said. "I thought we have come to discuss the contents of the comprehensive

financial statement but we find ourselves discussing the other financial statements," he said.

Former Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) President Sibongile Mazibuko also asked to be furnished with the comprehensive financial statement.

Chief Executive Officer Gideon Mhlongo said members of the public were free to seek clarification about the financial statements, and the contents thereof with the Municipal Council of Mbabane Finance Director Nhlanhla Vilakati

However, he said this was not the forum to discuss the issue.

Council sets turn around time to fix faults

THE Municipal Council of Mbabane has encouraged residents to visit their offices if they come across faulty infrastructure around the city.

Municipal Council of Mbabane Mayor Benito Jones said, "The Council has set a 24-hour response time to fix any issues that residents of the municipality have laid to them. This is part of the speedy service delivery we have committed ourselves to render to the residents of Mbabane."

Jones was speaking at the Municipal Council of Mbabane Annual General Meeting held at the Mountain Inn yesterday.

Zone Six resident Martha Dlamini during the question and answer session, complained about the lack of bus shelters around the city. "The state of some of the bus shelters is deplorable, what is the Council doing about this? Also I have observed that some of the street lights around my area have not been functioning for a while," she said.

Dlamini further alerted the Council to the number of potholes around the city and asked why they were not being attended too.

Jones said the problem was firstly, limited resources and secondly residents do not inform the Council about the problems that arise.

"We as a Council strive to repair and maintain infrastructure but we do not know all the points that need to be repaired," he said. Jones encouraged residents to inform the Council if they encounter faulty infrastructure. "The Council is here to serve you residents however, it is difficult to serve if we are not informed of where the problems are," he said. Another resident of Mbabane complained about the traffic congestion in the city,

especially around five in the afternoon. "Are there any plans in place for the Municipality to do something about the traffic congestion? It is affecting the business people around the central business district," he said. Municipal Council of Mbabane Chief Executive Officer Gideon Mhlongo responded by saying the Council is looking at various initiatives that are aimed at channelling traffic towards other outlets.

Inter Agencies loses E1.5m to Corban

INTER agencies (Ptv) Ltd has lost an application for an order to direct Corban Electrical and Electronics to pay E1.5 million.

The companies had entered into an agreement where Inter Agencies sold a plot situated in Manzini to Corban Electrical and Electronics for E3.5

However, the figure escalated to E5 million after Corban Electrical had failed to pay the amounts on the agreed dates. Corban Electrical later paid E3.5 million after it was funded by Standard Bank, leaving E1.5 million outstanding.

According to the agreement of sale, the amount was to be paid within a specified period and failing which, it was to be payable in full on demand by Inter Agencies or the agreement

would be cancelled and the paid amounts forfeited to cover damages. Inter Agencies then filed an application seeking an order for payment of the balance before the High Court and later filed an application for summary judgment.

A summary judgment is an order issued where one is owed and the other party is said to be without a

Corban Electrical opposed the application and the matter was heard by High Court Judge Nkululeko Hlophe. The judge agreed with submissions made by Corban Electrical that Inter Agencies had not complied with the agreement which stipulated that they should first issue a written demand before instituting court pro-

"There is no disputing the fact that the plaintiff (Inter Agencies) did not issue a written demand affording defendant a reasonable time after it

failed to pay in terms of the agreement before it instituted the summons, claiming the outstanding amounts.

It is a fact that without any demand whatsoever, the plaintiff issued a summons and claimed payment of the outstanding balance," Judge Hlophe said.

The judge dismissed Inter Agencies' contention that the summons it had issued amounted to a demand. The judge said the demand contemplated in the agreement was a condition precedent to the issuance of the summons. He said even though Corban Electrical breached the agreement by failing to pay the balance in instalments as agreed, it was not open to Inter Agencies to claim the outstanding amounts without complying with the agreement first.

He dismissed the application and ordered each party to pay its own costs.

WOMAN BASHER SKIPS COUNTRY TO SA

THE man who is reported to have brutally assaulted the mother of his child with a bush-knife is said to have skipped the country to neighbouring South Africa.

This publication yesterday reported on an incident where a teacher at Mphundle High School was attacked and brutally assaulted on Sunday, allegedly by the father of her child who was in the company of two other men. The incident is said to have also left other teachers at the school traumatised as their colleague was assaulted in their presence at the teachers' quarters. Information gathered is that the man, who has since been identified as Sabelo, crossed the border to South Africa where he is also employed.

This was after he freed the woman whom he had also kidnapped and taken to Ezulwini, where the assault continued.

Apparently, the man resorted to the heartless bashing after accusing the woman of cheating with another man who is her colleague at the same school.

According to close sources, the man issued death threats directed to the woman, saving he would return to finish her off if he continued to get information that she was still in intimate contact with the said male colleague.

At the moment, the woman has asked not to say anything concerning the matter as she stated she was still finding it difficult to come to terms with the incident. Meanwhile, police have urged members of the public to seek professional assistance and counselling whenever they encountered such misunderstandings in their relationships.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Phindile Vilakati, said their doors were open under the domestic violence department to assist couples who could be facing problems in their relationships.

Man arrested for sjamboking another

A man of Mbadlane has been arrested and charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm after he whipped another with a sjambok.

Robert Shongwe (50) allegrdly wrongfully and unlawfully assaulted Nkosinathi Madzinane with a sjambok while at Esiweni Primary School.

Apparently the two men had gone to the school for a meeting when they eventually had a misunderstanding which resulted to the whipping.

The accused person appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mayuso yesterday. When his rights to legal representation were explained to him, the accused elected to get the services of an

The matter was then postponed to October 26, 2016 pending setting of a trial date in the presence of his attorney. Meanwhile, two Mozambican men also appeared

before the same court after they were charged with contravening Section 7 as read with Section 8(1) of the Opium and Habit Forming Drug Act 37/1922.

Bernado Manhique and Jose Jameson were nabbed at Mhlumeni Border Post while in possession of 1.78 kilpgrammes.

Looking at the amount of the dagga, the senior magistrate first enquired how it was carried. It transpired that the dagga was in a bag belonging to the first accused person.

The second accused was subsequently discharged while the first accused pleaded guilty to the charge. In mitigation, the accused told the court he was asked by a friend back in Mozambique to bring him the

Swazi herb. He was accordingly found guilty by the court and was sentenced to four months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.

Of course, the Rating Act, 1995, is clear on what should happen to rates defaulters but your caring Council has resorted to opt for that avenue as the last resort.



Civil servant conned E130 000 through 'Gumtree'

A civil servant based in Mbabane is living to tell the tale after he was conned a hefty E130 000 through Gumtree's online classifieds site, in a bid to buy a top of the range Ford Ranger.

Gumtree South Africa is an online classifieds site with 1019185 live classified listings. Individuals list free classifieds advertisements or buy and sell for free.

The government employee is said to have seen the advert on Gumtree and quickly made contact with the advertiser who identified himself as Chris.

A source close to the matter said after he made enquires he was told that the car is in Westonia in Johannesburg.

"On the advert the car was sold for E180 000 and he thought he had found a bargain since a new Ford Ranger goes for about E350 000 while a second hand's market value is around E250 000. After contacting Chris, he tried to negotiate for a lower price and after some back and forth negotiation, Chris eventually lowered the price to E130 000 and he became more excited," said the source.

The source further said Chris asked the civil servant to pay E10 000 holding fee, which he paid. He said after a day, the civil servant was

further asked to pay a further E25 000 holding fees, since Chris claimed his boss was not happy with the E10 000 holding fee was too little yet many people were interested in buying the car.

"The civil servant called the 'boss' who confirmed that he required additional money to keep the car for him. After confirming with the 'boss' he deposited a further E25 000 into ABSA account," he said.

After a week the civil servant is said to have deposited the balance of E95 000 and later sent a confirmation slip of his deposit. After confirming receipt of the payment they are said to have arranged for a pick-up in Westonia.

"On the agreed date, the civil servant drove to Johannesburg in company of a friend to pick up 'his car," added the source.

Upon arrival they discovered that the address they were given is someone's homestead and the owner denied any knowledge of any one bearing the name Chris. "They then contacted Chris who gave them an alternative address, and upon reaching that address Chris was nowhere in sight and his cellphone was off till today."

The matter was then reported to the Swaziland Police and they are still in a process of liaising with their South African counterparts.

On another hand, a farmer was also conned about E60 000 after he bought hay bales on Gumtree. The farmer is said to have paid the hay bales into a Nedbank account and he was promised that a driver will be deliver his bails to Swaziland. The agreed date the farmer is said to have waited at the border and the driver never pitched up.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communication Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati has confirmed the reports yesterday.


The bus services Manzini, Siphofaneni,


This was during the tabling of the first quarter performance report by Dlamini. He tabled it before portfolio committee members of his ministry. The MPs wanted to know why they were always overlooked when there were events graced by His Majesty King Mswati III at Makhonza in the Shiselweni region. The MPs used an example of when there was an official opening of the Amitofo Care Centre.

The King officially opened the facility last week. The King was also having dinner with business people in the Shiselweni region last night, the MPs claimed they were not invited again.

They could not take it anymore, hence they decided to throw a salvo at the minister.

Zombodze Emuva MP Titus Thwala was the first to raise the issue. He blamed both the minister and Shiselweni Regional Administrator (RA) Themba Masuku. He said the

MPs wanted to know why they were always overlooked when there were events that were graced by His Majesty King Mswati III, at Makhonza in the Shiselweni region



RA should have invited them because they work in close cooperation with

"What is unfortunate is that if we do not attend these events, we are portrayed in the media as people who boycotted these events yet we were not invited," Thwala said.

Respect

He went on to state that the MPs should be given the respect they deserved because they were the pinnacle of the constituencies, which the system relied on to function.

He strongly accused the minister and the RA of killing the Tinkhundla system of governance by not recognising them as the integral part of the sys-

The Zombodze Emuva legislator said they also got information through the grapevine that there would be another major event tomorrow at Shiselweni. Again, the MPs complained of the fact that they were not invited.

Thwala narrated of an incident where one Shiselweni MP had his access to the Inkhundla centre compromised.

"The MP wanted to be given keys so that he could have access to the centre at any time. He wanted to have time to interact with the people of his constituency because in most instances, he would be in Parliament and his home was hardly accessible. This was because it was almost far away from the centre and there were dogs at the home. He was told he had to apply for the keys. My question is: were those having the keys made to apply?" Thwala said.

Cases

Thwala said there were many such cases in the region, where people had to see MPs outside the Tinkhundla centres because they did not have keys to the centres.

He said this was not good. Contrary to what was expressed by the Shiselweni legislators, the minister was praised by Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini.

"We work very well with the ministry and during the events that are attended by the King we are recognised and given the respect we deserve.

For that, I thank the ministry and the RA for the Lubombo region (Sylvia Mthethwa)," Dlamini said.

His sentiments were shared by Lugongolweni MP Joseph Souza, who also praised the minister and his team for taking care of his constituency.

Shiselweni II MP Mthokozisi Kunene accused the minister of meddling in issues of his constituency. He said the minister had a problem with accepting the fact that Shiselweni II had another person as a Member of Parliament; which was him in this case.

Kunene said Dlamini would sometimes convene people from his constituency without involving him.

He then said he envied Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini, who had praised the minister for working well with them as MPs from the Lubombo region.

He said he wished the situation was the same for Shiselweni region, where they were overlooked when there were important national assignments. In response, the Tinkhundla minister apologised for the situation the Shiselweni MPs were finding themselves in. He also stated that Maseyisini, which is his Inkhundla, was a neighbour to MP Kunene's constituency, which is Shiselweni II.

The minister said he would sometimes embark on projects in his constituency, where he would rope in people from his neighbouring constituencies such as Zombodze Emuva, Shiselweni II and Gege.

He apologised for any inconvenience caused by such arrangements.





Multi-partism dragged into Micro-Projects Bill

MEMBERS of Parliament are worried about the **Swaziland Community** Development Bill, 2016 that is now having multi-partism dragged into it.

Multi-partism is a term used to refer to multi-party democracy.

Such a system is currently not allowed in the country, because the constitution states that Swaziland will be run by the Tinkhundla system of gover-

The issue of the Bill was raised strongly during the tabling of the first quarter performance report of the ministry of economic planning and development, by Prince Hlangusemphi, who heads the ministry.

The minister was tabling the report before his ministry's portfolio committee, which was chaired by Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini.

The first MP to voice his comments about the matter was Nkwene MP Sikhumbuzo Dlamini.

"I have heard that other minis-

ters want to hijack the Bill. We call upon the minister to speed up the process and bring back the bill to parliament so it can be passed. We need such a Bill because the people in our constituencies want it," Dlamini said.

Effect

He noted there was information to the effect that the supporters of such a Bill were supporters of multi-party democracy.

Dlamini said the Bill had nothing to do with any political philosophies of a person, but only to develop the lives of the people in their constituencies.

Dlamini's sentiments were shared by Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini, who said they expected the Bill to be passed because Micro-Projects did a good job. He said the political opinions had nothing to do with the matter.

"If there is a political philosophy I strongly support, it's the Tinkhundla system of governance. Such a system is good for this country and I do not think how it can be said we want the Bill because we support multiparty democracy," Dlamini said.

Prince Hlangusemphi said the Bill had nothing to do with political orientations, but they were only making the activities of Micro-Projects to be within the parameters of the law. This was because Micro-Projects was doing projects that required huge amounts of money and that was outside the parameters of the law governing the organisation.

ment. He admitted it was an important Bill, which could empower the citizens.

The Tinkhundla Administration Bill was also another burning issue for the MPs. Some legislators even sympathised with Minister for Tinkhundla Administration and Development Mduduzi Dlamini. They told him things were not going well within his ministry. Matsanjeni North MP Phila Buthelezi even suggested that Dlamini should consult with his ancestors (kuhlabela labaphansi).

He also urged him to pray to God and reconcile with any person he may have wronged with-

MPs worried about stalled bills

MEANWHILE the MPs expressed concern about the Bills stalled by government yet are supposed to be passed.

The Bills in question are to be tabled by different ministries before the august House. The ministries included tinkhundla administration and development, economic planning and development and that of commerce, industry and trade.

The MPs expressed their worries mainly because some of these bills were at advanced stages with their enactments. Workshops have been condcuted on some of the bills, like the

one that seeks to convert Micro Projects to a parastatal. The bill was known as the Swaziland Community Development Bill, 2016. A workshop was conducted for the parliamentarians back in June. That was intended for the purposes of them to understand it so when they pass it, they understand its intention.

Another bill that worried the MPs is the Citizens Economic Empowerment Bill, 2016. The ministry for commerce, industry and trade was responsible for it. The first MP to raise the issue of the bill was Mayiwane MP Eric Sifiso Matsebula. The MP

advised minister for commerce, industry and trade that the bill should be sped up as it would empower people on starting and managing businesses, so as to improve the economy of the country. Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini also said the economic improvement of the country lied on the empowerment of the people of the country.

He said without them being at the forefront in running the economy, it would be difficult to turn the economy around for the better.

Minister Gideon Dlamini assured the MPs they were doing something about the Bill as they had to come up with regulations to support its enact-

in his ministry or cabinet.

strengthen sector coordination, align various plans and activities around the common goal of universal access to services for citizens and address some of the key issues.

WATER and sanitation in schools will be amongst the major topics to get prominence during the Joint Water and Sanitation Sector Review (JRS) three-day conference starting

THE National Association of Public Servants and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) has committed itself to fighting corruption in the country.

The union has embarked on an anti-corruption campaign themed "Together we can fight corruption".

NAPSAWU invited anticorruption stakeholders to a workshop where they were intensely educated corruption, and how it affects the economy of the country. Stakeholders that took part in the workshop included the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA), Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) and Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSPS) Crime and Fraud Unit.

NAPSAWU General Secretary Celumusa Tembe said the union took the decision to commit itself on the

campaign because corruption affects them more.

"We are public servants and are directly affected by corruption as we are paid by the government. However, the perception amongst the public is that public servants are the most corrupt people. We are here to get educated and find out how and where we can lend a helping hand towards the fight against corruption that is slowly ravishing the economy," he said.

Tembe said the union has dedicated the week to the Anti-Corruption campaign. He said tomorrow NAP-SAWU will engage in a march in the capital city centre and they will march to the Anti-Corruption Community offices and Prime Minister's office to deliver an Anti-Corruption declaration.

During the workshop, Majahonkhe Ngozo Education Officer at ACC told NAPSAWU members that government needs to make policies on receiving of gifts by public officers.

"There are many types of acts of corruption, some may be viewed as minor and innocent. A person may give a public officer E50 for appreciation for efficient and quick service delivery.

That act may viewed as innocent act but imagine if that individual comes to the office every second week for services and keeps on appreciating the services rendered by E50.

If that same person comes again with an illegal request the next day, would that public servant not compromise his or her ethics and bend the law to help someone who always appreciates his/her services?" he wondered.

Ngozo said his office does not encourage accepting of gifts, presents or money for any reason. He said once an officer gets used to getting 'thank you' for rendering services they then become accustomed to it.

Inefficiency a major contribution to corruption

INEFFICIENCY in public offices has been cited as one of the major factors that contribute to corruption in the country.

Participants in the workshop agreed that inefficiency in public officers forces members of the public to resort to bribing public officials into giving them the deserving service that they ought to be getting in the first place. "Being short-staffed can also lead to corruption, sometimes the ratio is difficult to work in and some people use their financial muscle to have service rendered to them fast," said Ntokozo Dlamini. Ngozo said corruption could be as simply as letting other people jump the queue. Nurses present at the workshop said they are always caught up in the middle when they are expected to let relatives or high profile people jump the queue and leave seriously sick on the queue just to service a person who only has a minor flu.

Police warn about online scams

POLICE have warned NAPSAWU members against engaging in online shopping.

Mpendulo Dlamini from the RSP Fraud Unit said the unit has recently had many cases where Swazis have been scammed from online purchases. "The cases vary but mostly its purchases of cars," he said. Dlamini said they must be vigilant in all purchases that they undertake especially to other countries. He said the authenticity of the company one is dealing with must be verified outside of what have been provided.

"Have the address of the company verified. We advise that when you want to undertake business in South Africa you drive and verify all the facts before paying the money," he said.

Dlamini also warned against purchasing land on Swaziland National Land (SNL) without having gone through all the tradition channels that one is supposed to follow when they purchase SNL. He further advised to have a monetary transaction documented and always have a witness. "Card skimming cases are also prevalent and you must be vigilant when making any form of transaction, especially when you have to pay using a portable speed point. Make sure that your bank card is not taken away where you cannot see it," he warned.

Report corruption to toll free 800 8000 - SRA

Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) has encouraged the public to report tax evaders through their toll free number,

The toll free number is a 24-hour number and it takes calls from both landline and cellphone free of charge.

SRA's Director of Internal Affairs Daniel Dlamini said the number is private as anyone can call anonymously and it will remain anonymous. "We urge the public to utilise the toll-free line to

help report tax evaders. The outside the country to whistle blower will not be asked to give their identity," he said, Dlamini said presently SRA does not have a whistleblower policy but it is on the cards. He said tax evasion erodes the tax base and it must be dealt with. He said SRA is currently promoting voluntary submitting of taxes. He further said, to keep corruption at bay SRA has no gift policy. He further encouraged anyone who wishes to buy

UMPHAKATSI GRABS' OLD WOMAN'S LAND

THE umphakatsi of Emvembili has forced a 78-year-old widow out of her land as it collaborated with the late chief's sister.

Gogo Sphelile Dlamini has been given 10 days to vacate her homestead situated at Ntfonjeni, to her neighbour Telive Dlamini who is the sister of the late chief Solani Dlamini.

It is said Telive Dlamini allegedly wants to give the land to her son Nhlanhla Simelane who is a policeman. The old woman's second son, 32-year-old Fana Sibandze said last week Tuesday to his shock he woke up to find five men dividing his late father's land with two wooden poles.

The men placed the poles at different points of the property effectively dividing it into two.

"I was so shocked to wake up and find these men placing wooden poles at different points in my late father's land. They stated that they had been sent by the *Umphakatsi* to divide the land," he said.

Sibandze said the land dispute had originally started after his father passed away in 2010, and had left the land to his wife (Gogo Sphelile Dlamini).

He said in 2010 the Sibandze family heard rumours doing the rounds that their neighbours were

interested in the land and intended to grab it. The issue was reported and heard by the Mvembili Umphakatsi Secretary Sihogo Mavuso. "Since my father passed away, our neighbours have been trying to take our land by force and they have now used the *Umphakat*-

si to force my mother to surrender her land. Since 2010, we have been desperately seeking help from various authorities including the *Umphakatsi* but we have been largely ignored because we are no bodies in the community," he added.

Sibandze stated that he has been ignored by the *Umphakatsi* thus was forced to take his case to *Ndabazabantu* offices in Pigg's Peak much to the disgust of the *Umphakatsi* secretary Sihlogo Mavuso, who allegedly stated that since the Sibandze's have involved *Ndaba zabantu* the *Umphakatsi* would no longer be involved.

"I went to the Ndabazabantu offices in Pigg's Peak to report the matter, as I was not being entertained by our Umphakatsi where I met Poko Mamba who called Mavuso to order him to go back to the Umphakatsi and discuss the matter. Mamba noted that it was illegal for the Umphakatsi to grab the land in such a manner unfortunately, they have not yet called me for a discussion date," added Sibandze.

Sibandze stated that the reason he received such harsh treatment from the *Umphakatsi* was because Telive Dlamini was related to the late chief.

According to Gogo Sphelile Dlamini the land has been for the Sibandze family since the 1950s.

On that note, Pigg's Peak
Ndabazabantu Poko Mamba confirmed the issue involving the
Sibandze family and stated that the
issue was under discussion. He said
it was still too early to give details
of the issue out to the public.

Secretary Mavuso declined to comment and Telive Dlamini also did not want to comment about the land dispute when approached.

HHOHHO PEOPLE CRY FOUL OVER BAD ROADS

THOUGH E650 million for the national budget 2016/17 was allocated to construction and rehabilitation various road networks in the country, people from Bulembu and Pigg's Peak are worried as it seems the former roads will never be attended to.

Chairman of the Pigg's Peak Mini and Bus Association Vuyani Dlamini noted that people had to hike to and from Bulembu.

It is said the estimated 150 residents who lived in the Bulemburarea had officially gone for three weeks without any form of public transportation.

"The often forgotten residents of Bulembu have now gone three weeks without any form of public transportation, and that in itself is unacceptable. Honestly how do they live as Bulembu is 11 kilometres away from Pigg's Peak?" Dlamini wondered.

Dlamini stated that another road system that was extremely bad was the road system between Pigg's Peak and Matsamo via Horo Ntfonjeni and Lufafa.

"These roads are hazardous especially now in the rainy season, they are unattractive to kombi operators thus there are fewer operators willing to service those routes. Residents of the mentioned areas have to wait long hours for public transport to come and transport them to their respective destinations.

Transport to those areas then overloads as residents are in a hurry to get to their various destinations."

Other roads that needed urgent attention were the roads between Buhleni and Mhlangatane.

Dlamini said the poor road conditions from Pigg's peak to Bulembu have ruined six kombis in the year 2016 alone. No kombi owner wants to have a kombi on the route as they all fear the poor road conditions.

"We appeal to government to at least rehabilitated the road as it is unattractive to the operators who are now refusing to have their kombis

Other roads that also need upgrades are between Horo Ntfonjeni, Lufafa Buhleni and Mhlangatane. All these require serious government attention as the residents who live in these areas are finding it harder and harder to commute to and from town."

Peak Timber Forests still to release fire report

THERE is still no damage report from Peak Timbers about the wildfire that ravaged the Peak Timber Forests about a month ago.

Nearly one month ago, the skies over Piggs Peak were black with smoke as a very large wild fire that reportedly started over Mkhumbane, spread over Ndeva and Emlembe.

The cause of the wildlife. A=VC according to senior sources was an arson attack but the damage report on the fire itself has not yet been realised by Peak Timbers.

Peak Timbers Public Liaison
Officer Nhlanhla Nxumalo said
the report would only be made
available after the insurance
company was satisfied with its
findings. Nxumalo stated that
the insurance company had to
be satisfied first with its findings then they would make the

damage report public.

Nxumalo said the wild fire would inhibit the company's social projects as the money lost due to the wildfires would have to be re-directed elsewhere.

Means

This then means that the people of Hhohho might lose more social projects if the company continued losing money.

"It's a sad situation as we all lose if wildfire destroys our forest, what this means is that as the company loses money through wildfires, we have to get it elsewhere to boost our social responsibilities and initiatives like the Lihananadza clinic.

If we lose money from our core business in the forest, where then will we get money for our social responsibilities as people are burning our forests?" he said.

SNUS engages legal services for charged UNISWA SRC

THE Swaziland Union of Students (SNUS) has roped in the services of an attorney to represent University of Swaziland Kwaluseni Students Representative Council members who have been charged with disorderly conduct.

The charged SRC members are Brian Sangweni (President), Sphesihle Shota Simelane (Director of Health), Pholani Lex Nxumalo (Director of Canteen) and Sandile Berry Dlamini (Chairperson).

SNUS has asked students not to be despaired by the victimisation from the institution.

The four were charged after a class boycott which took place following a joint meeting at Kwaluseni Campus where students resolved to boycott classes until their issues were addressed.

SNUS President Thembelihle
Dlamini said the charge stated that
on September 7, the four acted in
common purpose as they allegedly
blocked traffic at Kwaluseni main
gate. During the boycott, UNISWA
Registrar Dr Salebona Simelane
informed this publication that the act

was unusual because as a university they were not aware of it.

Simelane said they just saw students convened under trees demonstrating.

Soon after that, the vice-chancellor issued a memo advising students who would partake in the 'illegal' boycott that the university would take measures against them.

Kindly

SNUS has not taken kindly to the allegations as they stated this was a tactic by the university working with government to suppress the students

from voicing out their grievances. According to the SNUS president, they have already hired a lawyer to help them with the matter.

"They must drop all the charges laid against our leaders, lest they face the might of the students," Dlamini stated.

The president also urged all students in the country to rally behind their colleagues. Dlamini said as SNUS they believed the four students were not guilty of any charge laid against them, however, were being persecuted for refusing to be puppets of the university administration.

He said the university was, intimidated because of the students consistent refusal into submitting to the administration's repression.

The president said their colleagues were slapped with charges because of their persistent struggle against corruption, poor quality of education and mostly by standing firm to the resolutions of students.

"We therefore advise all our colleagues not to despair, for these are signs of an administration that has run out of ideas, one that is crumbling yet resisting to succumb," Dlamini stated.

Solitary confinement cell most painful punishment

A 16-year-old minor who has been serving time in a solitary confinement cell for about five months awaiting sentencing has said this was the most painful of all punishments.

In an interview, the minor said he did not care if he was found guilty or innocent, all he wanted was to get out of the solitary confinement cell.

"I miss school and I might go mad in that cell all by myself. I do not care what happens to me now as I have already suffered enough for all my sins," the minor said, adding he had already spent five months and 27 days in the solitary cell at the Pigg's Peak Correctional facility. This is because he is too young to be detained with adult prisoners.

The minor was originally arrested on March 23 for theft as he was accused of stealing five pairs of sneakers worth

E4 000 from Musa Manzini of Luhlangotsini. The minor's father appeared before the Pigg's Peak

bail for the minor which was

set at E2 000 in July by Senior Magistrate Siphosini Dlamini. However, the minor's father could not raise the bail money, forcing the minor to continue his time in jail.

The minor had appeared regularly at the Pigg's Peak
Magistrate's Court for remand hearings dressed in his school uniform.

He asked the magistrate in July to be allowed to spend time in an adult prison fearing he would go mad if he continued to spend time alone.

The minor again re-appeared in the same court but before Magistrate Simangele Mbatha, only to be told to go back to the Pigg's Peak Correctional facility until October 3, for his sentencing.

Child-headed family asking for help

The youngest child in her family was six years old, and was able to attend school because of the implementation of the Free Primary Education (FPE).


However, with the current drought which had resulted to a shortage of food, she too would drop out of school. The six-year-old needs school uniform.

4.3 Ensure equal access for all women and men to affordable and quality technical, vocational and tertiary education, including university


4.4 Substantially increase the number of youth and adults who have relevant skills, including technical and vocational skills, for employment, decent jobs and entrepreneurship.



A MYTH DISPROVED: CONDOMS DON'T REDUCE SEXUAL PLEASURE



NO device is more effective to prevent HIV infection, which is a sexually-transmitted infection, than the condom.

Prophylactics (condoms) originally provided a modern means of preventing unwanted pregnancies and blocking sexually-transmitted infections.

The arrival of AIDS gave new urgency to the use of condoms.

Readers of this column need not be reminded that condoms in Swaziland have been unpopular for some time.

The reasons people dislike the devices are not unique to our country, and have much in common to the reasons condoms have been rejected elsewhere in the world. It all boils down to this: condoms have been unpopular because men and women them unnatural, an artificial barrier that stands in the way of pleasure during intercourse.

One common complaint is that condoms cause a man to lose his

Is there merit to this complaint? Or is this a just a belief that has taken root - in other words, just something placed in someone's

The answer can only come from a respectable and credible scientific study. People's opinions matter, but in the end these are just



beliefs, or a matter of faith, if they cannot be supported by facts. But where shall facts about condom use be found? Only through the rigours of a "by the book" and closely monitored study can any real facts be obtained.

Intercourse

The matter is not just whether condoms make people's physical experience during intercourse less pleasurable. More is at stake during our current AIDS crisis, particularly in our country where HIV is wreaking such personal, social and economic damage. If people can be presented with facts on the way the body responds to condoms, this will help persuade reasonable people to decide to use condoms. Such a decision is a life or death choice for the man and his partner. Clearly, a study is required.

Because of the central importance condoms play in preventing HIV transmission, a study was undertaken, and its results were published last week in the publication 'The Journal of Sexual Medicine.'

The study undertaken at the Indiana University's Kinsey Institute for Research in Sex, Gender and Reproduction tested about 500 men under the age of 40. The research found that 16% of these men complained of occasional difficulty maintaining erections, but with further testing it was found they had this complaint with or without using condoms. They experienced erectile dysfunction as a physical condition unrelated to condom use.

In other words, the problem was with the man physically, not with the condom.

Problems However, the men blamed the condom for their problem. This has probably been the case as long as condoms have been available: men disappointed at their inability to maintain an erection find the condom to be a convenient excuse or scapegoat.

This information is passed on to others, and the condom acquired the reputation of inhibiting a man's sexual performance.

However, a related study found that younger men inexperienced with condom use did experience temporary loss of erection, "but only in the first minute" until the man became used to and forgot about the condom.

"Condom-associated erection

problems have been a very underresearched topic," said Dr. Cynthia Graham, co-author of the Kinsey Institute study on the effects of condom use and sexual activity. "Increasing evidence suggests, however, they may influence whether condoms are used correctly or from start to finish of sex."

The study found, "The lack of research into the broader issues which could impact penile function means that little of the link between a man's psychological state and future performance has been uncovered, but men who first experience loss of erection when they use condoms might worry about [difficulty] experiencing erections more generally and hence be more vulnerable [to erectile problems]."

The study looked at other data to discover that in the US, where all the study subject resided, about 16 percent of American men under 40 reported occasion problems maintaining an erection.

One reason, particularly amongst young men inexperienced with wearing condoms, is that more than a third of the men involved in the study had never been taught how to use a condom correctly. Researchers: felt this could be a major factor in young men believing that using a condom will cause problems for them during intercourse.

Said Dr. Graham, "It's troubling that so many men are lacking basic knowledge when it comes to condom application, calling into question the efficacy—or even existence of—sexual education in schools.

"Without adequate grounding in how to practice safe sex, the risk of unwanted pregnancies and sexually transmitted infections remains that much higher—8 consequence that could easily be allayed by putting sexual health provisions in place," she said.

This article however, requires that I make my own analysis and interpretation of WHAT SOLIDARI-TY MEANS TO ME.



When learning is both difficult and dangerous

Five years after Cabinet took he decision to interven, as serice delivery on Eastern Cape chools had disintegrated, no real progress has been made, write Lisa Draga and Daniel's off

Carlisle Bridge Primary Schools is a smatteringrofavindowheds reinen davels near Grahamstown in a Henry Eastern Cape, Pupils and teachers q are without electricity, the school is supplied with water by harvesting rainwater and the only decent it toilets were funded by a local taxi

For a school like this, the Minimum Norms and Standards Minimum Frastructure regulations hold the promise of a liberating education system as enshrined in the Bill of Rights.

Under the deadlines prescribed by the Norms and Standards law. Carlisle must be replaced by a new school, built of appropriate



materials and supplied with the necessary basic services by November 29. But it's clear that this will not happen.

In fact, of the 24 schools the Eastern Cape Department of Education (ECDoE) planned to build in the 2015/16 financial year, only three were actually built.

Service delivery is happening at a grindingly slow pace.

Underlying the failures of service delivery is a weak administration, short of skilled technical staff and permanent, principled leadership, suffering from highly inefficient budgeting and expenditure processes and besieged by corrup-

The long-standing education crisis in the Eastern Cape has not

In 2011, the total collapse of the education system saw pupils left stranded without transport and many of those able to reach schools were forced to go hungry once there.

These transport and nutrition services were stopped after the department had massively overspent, leaving the province's pockets empty

Rotting roofs, collapsing classrooms and other dire school infrastructure made learning difficult and often dangerous.

In March 2011, the cabinet made the decision to intervene in the administration of the province in terms of Section 100 of the constitution.

Section 100 allows the national executive, as an extreme measure, to temporarily assume the functions of a province if service delivery has disintegrated. The Star

THE Municipal Council of Mbabane has recorded a profit of E4.2 million for the financial year 2015/2016.

According to the Municipal Council of Mbabane annual report 2015/2016, the council recorded a revenue of E83 million which is an increase from the E76 million of the previous financial year.

The report said grants and subventions were around E3 million and other operating income was just over E13 million which took the grand total of income to be E100 million.

With regards to expenditure the council said the staff costs were around E43 million, depreciation was E13 million and other operating costs were E39 million.

Thus total expenditure for the year was around E95 million," reads the report as part.

NETS E4.2M PROFI

The council said the operating profits for the year were E4.2 million which represented a turnaround from last financial year where the council reported a loss of E3.3 million.

Financing

"Finance income; income derived from financing like interest from bank account, increased from E4.2 million to E5.3 million. Finance costs decreased from E1 million to E805 000 which likely further boosted the councils coffers," the Council said.

Meanwhile, council also announced that it had maintained its credit rating for securing debt.

"Council's rating was again left unchanged from what it was in the previous financial year with the following results.

For its ability to service its long term financial obligations, Council obtained BBB+, meaning that over and above being able to repay its maturing long term financial obligations, Council is also considered a safe place for investment.

For its ability to service its maturing short-term financial obligations, the Council obtained an A3, meaning that its financial statements exhibit reasonable certainty for timely payments.

The credit rating was conducted annually to measure council's relative ability to honour its unsecured maturing financial obligations as at the end of each financial year and one year into the future," reads the report as part.

The rating agency noted that the council's rating would improve if its size and scope of operations were to increase and if it was able to raise sufficient funding to finance all of its planned capital expenditure; preferably through grant funding as borrowing could result in a rise in its gearing and pull down its rating.

Mbabane council assets up 7% to over E600 million

THE Municipal Council of Mbabane has recorded a total assets base increase of seven percent from E565.4 million during the previous financial year to E605.1 million.

According to the Municipal Council of Mbabane annual report 2015/2016 this increase was largely due to an increase in property, plant and equipment due to roads rehabilitation, mainly Gwamile street widening, and an increase in cash balances due to delays in use of funds received from the World Bank for further roads rehabilita-

"Trade and other receivables balance, which is the amounts owed to

the Municipal Council, went down since central government paid in full all rates due by her rates by the end of the financial year. Collections from private rates debtors went up by seven percent from 69 percent to 76 percent of total private rates debtors," reads the report in part.

The Municipal Council said under the Swaziland Local Government Projects (SLGP) the Council completed the construction of phase one of Gwamile widening in ward four.

"The completed section of the road is about 400m and it includes Mantsholo and Pine Valley intersection, and the total cost of the project was E15.7 million.

The next phase of Gwamile widening will be constructed in the financial year 2016/17. To be constructed under this project will be the bypass road," said the Municipal Council.

It further mentioned that when completed, the upgraded road would be 2.1 km in length and would improve the traffic flow into the central business district from Fonteyn, Thembelihle and pine valley area.

Also under the SLGP, the Council said it completed the installation of Light Emitting Diode (LED) lights along Dabede and Zwide Street in the CBD at a total cost of E700 000.



Gordhan investigation 'needs to be done quickly'

NEW YORK - Splits within South Africa's ruling African National Congress may cause it to lose power at the next national elections in 2019, according to a senior cabinet member.

"If the situation stays as it is, the risk of losing power is there," Malusi Gigaba, the Home Affairs Minister, said in an interview in New York on Monday. "The ANC is divided. The centre doesn't seem to be holding. We need to address that."


While the ANC has dominated South African politics since the end of apartheid in 1994, it is facing rising discontent as the economy barely grows and unemployment stands at 27 percent, among the highest levels globally. The party suffered its worst electoral result to date in municipal voting on August 3, when it lost control of the cities of Johannesburg, the main economic hub, Pretoria, the capital, and Port Elizabeth.

"The elections drove a cold and brutal message that we can never take the support of the people for granted," Gigaba, 45, said. "You have an unprecedented level of people who are feeling pessimistic, who feel the country is not going in the right direction. They say there are no jobs, there are high levels of corruption, crime is high."

The party's divisions have been worsened, according to Gigaba, by a police investigation into Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan, which may lead to his arrest. President Jacob Zuma has dismissed Gordhan's request to fire the nation's tax chief for insubordination and delayed his attempts to install a new board at the loss-making state airline. **Bloomberg**

Outperforming rand dips under R14/\$

CAPE TOWN – The rand broke through the R14/\$ ceiling yesterday as the emerging market currency made its fourth straight day of gains against the dollar.

"The last time we were below R14/\$ was on 8
September, but that for a very short time," said Umkhulu Consulting analyst Adam Phillips yesterday. "I think the normal monthly forex offering from exporters, a tiny helping hand from offshore yield players (bonds also had a good day), selling of dollar at the end of the third quarter and concerns as to what to expect from the Federal Reserve Bank meeting topped the list."

By 09:00, the rand was up 0.32% at R13.99/\$, 0.35% up at R18.23/£ and 0.34% up at R15.63/€. "The rand is running hard, making its fourth straight day of gains against the dollar yesterday and its sixth straight day of relative



outperformance," said RMB analyst John Cairns yesterday. "As we set out yesterday, you might question if the gains are justified but there is no reason to doubt, or try and fade, the trend."

Phillips said South Africa's political situation might be calming down. "I think it would be wrong to ignore what has gone on," he said. "(Finance Minister Pravin) Gordhan has remained in the saddle in terms of the recent announcements on SAA and I think we have to assume he is

going to be around to table the finance ministry's medium-

term budget in late October.

"However, it remains to be seen if he is around when the rating agencies make their decisions. I think that could be a good reason for the strength in the rand because exporters have been holding on, wondering what has changed.

"They would be right in their thinking and all it took was for a few to sell and others were forced to. That is why I believe the recent moves are a short-term phenomenon." FIN24

'R5bn SAA guarantee staved off risk for all SOEs'

CAPE TOWN – If South African Airways had not received a R5bn going concern guarantee, it would have posed a systemic risk to all state-owned enterprises (SOEs) in South Africa, Deputy Finance Minister Mcebisi Jonas said yesterday.

Jonas, who made a few introductory remarks, was part of a delegation from National Treasury and SAA who briefed Parliament's Standing Committee on Finance on the airline's preliminary financial statements for 2014-15.

He said SAA would have been unable to finalise their financial statements without a guarantee. "But it would have been been prudent to give that kind of support without first mitigating the fiscal risk,"

Jonas pointed out that SOEs' financial position poses a significant risk to South Africa's fiscal position. In fact, the financial well-being of all CEOs is being taken into account when rating agencies assess South Africa's credit risk.

Before handing over to acting CEO Musa Zwane, Jonas said the R4.7bn guarantee SAA received put the airline in a position to finalise sets of financial statements for both 2014-15 and 2015-16.

The 2015-16 financial statements would be finalised before September 30, Jonas said.

PwC warns of platinum shortage

JOHANNESBURG - Auditing firm PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) has warned that the platinum industry was unlikely to meet the demand for the precious metal in the medium term.

The firm on Monday released a report claiming the supply would be subdued as a result of a lack of investment in the industry.

The report was in line with previous studies on the platinum industry that noted that a deficit in platinum supply would deepen.

Andries Rossouw, PwC's partner in assurance, said the lack of investment due to the low price environment and industrial action from 2012 to 2014 would continue to put pressure on the existing supply deficit. 'South Africa's platinum miners had to cut costs and reduce capital expenditure in order to survive in the hope that normality will return to the platinum sector," he said. The report notes how despite substantial investment in platinum mines in the last 15 years, supply had been on a downward trend since 2006. It said the levels of investment started decreasing as far back as 2008 in contrast to capital expenditure by the overall global mining industry, which only started decreasing in

"Platinum miners' struggles are not dissimilar to those flowing throughout the South African mining industry - cost pressures, declines in commodity prices, and low or negative profit margins."

ONE-UPMANSHIP DISGUISED AS ENTREPRENEURSHIP

HAVE you been through the extreme endurance test that is 'Entrepreneur's Day'? This parent has:

Entrepreneur's Day, and there is a special place in hell for the person who thought this would be a good educational experience. For those of you who have not experienced this particular hell, the kids make some products, set-up a stand and sell the products to other kids.

Sounds good, right. Except when the teachers let the children pick their own groups and then [they] switch, disband and reform groups faster than alliances on a reality TV show.

The products change on a weekly basis, until a week beforehand I had to intervene and say: "This is what you are making".

Then I had to go out and spend my money (which in theory I should get back, but who are we kidding), assist in the making of the goods and then go to the school and help set up the stand. At what part is the child in charge of this process?

Oh yes, and I have a massive deadline at work so I can't just take half a day off and make everything pretty

I was there this morning to set up a gazebo and there were stands there where the children were running a generator. A GENERATOR! Are you kidding me?

Any person who thinks that the kids are going to do this on their own clearly has not met many grade seven children, who are like ADHD goats at the best of time.

It's not a chance to score, to show-off, or for parents to work off their own need to excel. It's supposed to be about children learning valuable skills for life. That can surely be done without turning Entrepreneur's Day into a twice-yearly nightmare of stress and expense and competitiveness for parents.

Essentially this is a project that is custom-made for children with over-achieving parents.

To which another parent replied: Dude. You have no idea. My son goes to a school in [northern Joburg]. There were stands there where the gazebos were branded with the group's name, complete with teardrop banners and full printed menus.

There was a group selling Emoji pillows for R150. Please tell me whose pocket money paid for that? Some were flighting adverts, others had machine-printed flyers, one had a series of jumping castles.

Said another:

All school projects should be geared towards getting the kids to put in maximum effort, and the parents should simply be there in a scene-setting capacity (taking them to the library or setting up those tricky gazebos).

For something like this, the playing fields should be levelled, for example, everyone gets a budget of R500 or whatever, and then they have to

show how they used that money and made the most of it, etc. All this really does is illustrate how in a capitalist society, trust fund babies excel over those from more humble backgrounds.

Exactly. I once did a story on the entrepreneurial focus at a couple of upmarket schools, and I was appalled. Each of those schools had scholarship programmes, so there were children of domestic servants or (in one case) a nearby township studying there.

It was plain even then (about eight or ten years ago) that a kid who didn't have a wealthy helicopter parent (or one who could afford to delegate the role of helicopter parent) was going to be crushed by the experience.

Training for real life? Yeah, right. I would prefer that any child of mine delayed that kind of agony to a time when they had just a 'leeetle' bit of maturity.

But the big question, for me, is how does any of this teach entrepreneurship, rather than one-upman-



ship? You could do that with a much simpler scenario: four groups per class, each with a budget of R300 to R500 (keep it low) to make and market simple things like lemonade, muffins and homemade bracelets from el cheapo wooden beads (which they are assigned – no choice in the matter).

In an initial experimental period the kids make, say, lemonade from two lemons, cost the lemons, sugar and electricity, and work out what each drink will cost and what you can charge. Everybody shares this in class, makes suggestions and so on.

Teacher points out missed input costs like labour or cups, for example, talks about the environmental costs and how that affects your choice of cup, and asks how you'll 'market' this lot – do you have budget for a poster or labels? (Parents are STRICTLY forbidden to contribute anything other than advice, and instructions on how to use the popcorn-maker.)

Finally, you have a much more down-market day where the children are supervised and taught how to keep tally of and secure their money. (I hear in one case, for example, the cash on a stall managed by Grade 2s somehow went missing.
Surprise!) All profits go into a kitty for something the class chooses to do. (Fun social responsibility project, I'd hope, where other things can be learned?)

The scenarios I've seen described must be very poor learning experiences; certainly they're unlikely to teach responsibility – or lead to a great feeling of achievement – if parents are forking out and pitching in to that extent. And how much do they learn of the basics? As one mom wrote: "... if they make a profit they will be happy and if they make a loss they will be devastated. But they will have no idea why this happened."

It's not a chance to score, to show off, or for parents to work off their own need to excel. It's supposed to be about children learning valuable skills for life. That can surely be done without turning Entrepreneur's Day into a twice-yearly nightmare of stress and expense and competitiveness for parents.

7 principles of work success

THE Happiness Advantage:
The Seven Principles of Positive
Psychology that Fuel Success
and Performance at Work, by
Shawn Achor.

This book, published six years ago, succinctly captures seven principles that will enhance anyone's work life. While many of the ideas are found elsewhere, this is an engaging summary account. If you take the advice to heart, you will have a distinct advantage in the workplace. I will share just three principles.

The first is the debuiling of a myth. The myth is that if you work hard, you can achieve success in your chosen field, and once you achieve success, you'll be happy. The success could be the raise in your salary or position in the organisation, status or great wealth.

Ground-breaking research in the fields of positive psychology and

neuroscience has demonstrated unequivocally that there is a relationship between success and happiness - however, not in the direction we commonly assume.

Meta-analysis of happiness research of over 200 scientific studies on nearly 275 000 people demonstrates that happiness leads to success in nearly every area of our lives, from marriage to health, and more specifically in our careers and businesses.

Success does not lead to happiness; happiness leads to success!
Success is not the cause of happiness: it is the result of happiness as evidenced by literally thousands of scientific studies. This explains the title of the book – The Happiness Advantage.

One simple illustration was an experiment with four-year-olds that demonstrated the positive effects of happiness on solving puzzles. Some of the children were first asked to recall events that made them happy, and the others were simply asked to solve the puzzle. In the lives of fouryear-olds, the event that made them happy was recalling the jelly they had at lunch, and this made them more successful. Similarly, happy recollections had a positive effect on the accuracy of doctors doing a complex diagnosis.

Finding anything in your day at work that makes you feel happier will make you more productive. While this may seem simplistic, the scientific evidence is unassail-

able, and it would be ridiculous not to use this insight. That is why sophisticated companies cultivate working environments where employees experience small bursts of happiness - sharing birthday cake or a quick game of pool.

You, too, could do this in your business. Another principle for improving happiness and consequently success, author Shawn Achor calls 'the Tetris Effect'.

In one study students played Tetris, (a shape-forming computer game) for hours. For days after the study, some participants literally couldn't stop seeing the world as sets of Tetris shapes, from books on tables to actually dreaming about shapes falling from the sky.

This effect is called a "cognitive afterimage", very similar to the dots in your vision seconds after someone takes a flash-photograph of you.

Achor describes work he had been doing with the tax accountant KPMG, to help their tax auditors and managers become happier.

These are people who spend eight to 14 hours a day finding errors in

tax forms and like the students who had played Tetris, their brains were becoming wired to look for mistakes. "When they went home to their families, they noticed only the Cs on their kids' report cards, never the As."

The problem is being unable to compartmentalise abilities: athletes who can't stop competing with their friends or families, and managers who can't stop micromanaging their children's lives.

This is the negative Tetris Effect.
Imagine a way of seeing that a constantly picked up on the possitives in every situation - the positive Tetris Effect: "Instead a creating a cognitive pattern that a looks for negatives and blocks success, it trains our brains to seen the world for the opportunities and ideas, that allow our success rate to grow."

Armed with positivity, the brain is open to possibility. "We can train our brains to let in these messages that make us more adaptive, more creative, and more motivated - messages that allow us to spot and pounce on more opportunities.


PRESIDENT ZUMA URGES STATES TO TACKLE FORCIBLE DISPLACEMENT

GENEVA - President Jacob Zuma told the United Nations that South Africa continues to afford forcibly displaced persons the "right to live wherever you like and the right to work, study and access social services".

In his address at a high level summit on refugees and migrants, he called on member states to do the same, saying: "Our common humanity requires that we respect each person-'s human dignity in equal measure. No instance should enjoy more attention and concern than the other."

South Africa, Zuma told the gathering in the General Assembly Hall, is "the largest single recipient of asylum seekers" in sub-Saharan Africa, and the country "recognises that in order to adequately address the forcible displacement of people, we must address the root causes of this phenomenon".

"Under-development is a key driver of the displacement of people and in turn can lead to armed conflict," he

"A concerted global effort to address the questions of underdevelopment and armed conflict should therefore be a central focus of all member states. He noted the African Union's aspiration "under its Agenda 2063 to

silence all guns by 2020" and said the continental body had "made strides in efforts to prevent and end conflicts through our involvement in high-level political mediation and conciliation efforts as well as contributing to peace-keeping and peace-making missions". TMG Digital

Madonsela urges students to fight social injustice 'with their minds'

JOHANNESBURG - Public Protector Thuli Madonsela urged students to "use their minds" to fight social injustice in the way writer Sol Plaatjie fought the system "with his

"Social injustice matters, it matters now and everyone deserves social justice. As long as there is injustice somewhere, sustainable peace cannot be experienced anywhere," Madonsela said on Monday.

The outgoing public protector was speaking at the dialogue sessions with students and staff of North West University in Mahikeng.

Hlaudi wants another SABC job

PARLIAMENT - SABC Chief Operating Officer Hlaudi Motsoeneng is refusing to go.

There are growing calls for him to resign after the Supreme Court of Appeal in Bloemfontein (SCA) threw out his application for leave to appeal a High Court ruling that his appointment to the post was irrational and should be set aside.

Motsoeneng wants the SABC to give him another position at the public broadcaster if he is removed as chief operating officer as directed by the court.

His lawyer indicated on Monday that Motsoeneng would not appeal the SCA judgment in the Constitutional Court because there were no constitutional issues to raise with the highest court in the land.

The SCA found on Monday that Motsoeneng's appointment was invalid and irrational. The court said his appointment must be set aside.

On Monday, Motsoeneng's lawyer, Zola Majavu, said his client was waiting for the SABC to decide his fate.

SABC spokesman Kaizer Kganyago said a decision on the judgment had not been taken. "Our lawyers are studying the judgment and they are not in a position to give us what the way forward will be."

Last year, Judge Dennis Davis ruled in the Western Cape High Court that given the adverse findings of Public Protector Thuli Madonsela against Motsoeneng, it had been irrational on the part of Communications Minister Faith Muthambi to appoint him as COO in a permanent capacity.

Pupil killed 'for making noise in church'

DURBAN - A Grade 10 Nothando High School pupil in northern KwaZulu-Natal, was stabbed to death at a church service on Friday evening.

Ntokozo Ncube, of KwaMhlabuyalingana, was allegedly stabbed by his friend and died at the Mboza clinic.

It is alleged that Ncube was playing with other friends and causing

noise during the service.

His father, Mabili Ncube, said he was shocked and hurt that his son was killed for playing with others.

"What I heard is he was playing with others, slapping them in the faces and one of his friends asked him why he was beating others. "He pulled a knife and stabbed him in the chest and he fell. His friends took him to the Zamazama Clinic

and then to Mboza after they could not get help at the other former," said Ncube.

Provincial police spokesman, Lieutenant-Colonel Shooz Magudulela, confirmed the incident. He said the suspect was arrested and charged with murder. He will appear in the Manguzi Magistrate's Court soon. Daily News

92% of public service senior managers filed electronic disclosures


JOHANNESBURG - Minister of **Public Service and Administration** Ngoako Ramatlhodi told Parliament that 8 943 senior managers in the public service filed electronic disclosures of interest between 2015 and April of this year.

Ramatlhodi said out of a total of 9 689 senior management staff members in national and provincial government offices, 92% had submitted an electronic financial disclosure since the launch of the electronic submission system in 2015.

"We have strengthened the requirement to disclose electronically in the

PSR (Public Service Regulations) 2016. Employees will disclose manually only under exceptional circumstances, which will have to be authorised by respective heads of departments," he said.

They will provide reassurance to residents while acting as 'professional witnesses' gathering evidence of anti-social behaviour - and presenting it to campus bosses who will then take action.

The scheme is designed to end the rowdy parties which have plagued neighbourhoods for years.

Local councillor Rebecca Moore said the move - thought to be one of the first of its kind - will be mutually beneficial to both students and neighbours.

She said: "They will act as a visi-

UN says CAR clash killed six people

BANGUI - The UN peacekeeping mission in the Central African Republic on Monday revised a death toll for weekend clashes in the heart of the nation down to six. "The total number of people killed was six," Minusca force chief Herve Verhoosel said in a statement, adding an investigation into the deadly violence was under way.

Tension between royal family, ruling Islamists

RABAT - Tensions have erupted between Morocco's royal establishment and the Islamist ruling party, with the Islamist justice minister complaining of "weird" goings-on in the run-up to a parliamentary election next month. Mustapha Ramid accused his government colleague Mohammed Hassad, a technocrat appointed by the royal palace as interior minister, of monopolising decisions on organising the election and failing to consult with the justice ministry. Unlike rulers in Tunisia, Egypt and Libya who were overthrown in Arab Spring revolutions in 2011, Morocco's King Mohamed rode out popular protests while ceding some authority to the government, which has been led for the past five years by the Islamist Justice and Development Party (PJD). AFP

Zim civil servants face tough time

HARARE - The payment of salaries for thousands of Zimbabwe's public servants for this month will spill over into the next as government battles the effects of a fail-

ing economy. Employees of the military were to get their salaries yesterday, while the health



sector and police will be paid on Tuesday next week. However, teachers, pensioners and other civil servants will be paid in the first week of October.

France presses Kabila for elections date

UNITED NATIONS - France on Monday voiced deep concern over unrest in the Democratic Republic of Congo as it urged President Joseph Kabila to make clear a timetable for elections. Foreign Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault called the situation in the DRC "very dangerous and extremely worrying" amid deadly clashes ahead of plans for a major opposition demonstration.

Tourist killed by elephant in national park

MOMBASA - An Italian tourist was trampled to death by an elephant while photographing the animal at the Tsavo National Park near the Kenyan coastal town of Malindi on Sunday, police said. Malindi police boss Muchangi Mutava said on Monday that the 66-year-old man was attacked by the elephant near the Swara Camp he stayed in on the Kulalu ranch in the park. The tourist spotted the elephant at a water point a few metres from the camp.



GAMBIAN INTERIOR MINISTER FIRED, REPLACED WITH COUP PLOTTER

BANJUL - Gambian President Yahya Jammeh has fired his interior minister and replaced him with a military officer previously convicted of plotting a coup against him, in the latest unpredictable move from the West African strongman.

A press release read over state television on Sunday night said long time minister Ousman Sonko would be replaced "with immediate effect" by Momodou Alieu Bah, who helped mount a 2006 coup against Jammeh.

Jammeh has fended off several attempted coups since coming to power in 1994 via the same method.

Bah had previously served as finance director for the Gambia's armed forces, and hails from Lamin, a village close to the capital, Banjul.

He was sentenced to 25 years in jail in 2006 following the

attempted overthrow but granted amnesty in 2010 after he testified during the trial of the chief of defence staff of the Gambia Armed Forces, Lieutenant General Lang Tombong Tamba.

Bah's sacked predecessor Sonko was previously a member of the presidential guard and protected Jammeh when he was threatened

with a separate coup attempt in 2000, rather than joining other guards mounting an insurrection.

Sonko had served as interior minister since 2006 except for his brief 2012 appointment as ambassador to Spain, a decision that Jammeh reversed one week

Sonko's profile was still avail-

able to view on the Gambian government's website on Monday, but had disappeared by the evening.

Last week the United Nations human rights chief Zeid Ra'ad Al Hussein said he was "alarmed" by reports of violence against protesters, and the torture and unexplained deaths of detainees in the Gambia, warning of "serious repercussions of any further decline in the situation".

Jammeh is expected to win a fifth term in a December election, and his regime is regularly accused by rights groups of arranging the forcible disappearance of opponents.

Since independence from Britain in 1965, Gambia has had just one other leader, Dawda Jawara, who served until the current president toppled him in a 1994 coup.

Govt denies claims Mutharika suffered cardiac arrest

LILONGWE - The government of Malawi has denied social media rumours claiming that President Peter Mutharika suffered a cardiac arrest.

According to a Nyasa Times report, Mutharika had been reported as having "good health" while reports confirmed that he was currently in New York attending the United Nations General Assembly.

Francis Kasaila, Minister for Foreign Affairs and International Co-operation in the country, dismissed the claims, assuring Malawians that Mutharika was enjoying

his stay in the United States. Describing the Malawian leader as "very strong and healthy", Kasaila expressed his suspicions that the rumour was spread by members of the opposition who had malicious intent.

The development followed on shortly after social media posts surfaced saying the southern Africa country leader was down after being affected by cardiac arrest.

Mutharika has since been captured looking fit and vibrant while mingling with dignitaries in New York.

False reports on the state of Mutharika's health have caused the president to recently seek regulation regarding social media recently,

Six killed in ambush by Boko Haram militants

ABUJA - Suspected members of the Islamist militant group Boko Haram killed six people in an attack on a commercial convoy being escorted by the army in Nigeria's north eastern state of Borno, the military said on

Boko Haram has killed more than 15 000 people and displaced 2.4 million across Nigeria, Cameroon, Niger and Chad during a seven-year insurgency aimed at creating a state based on a radical interpretation of Islamic law.

Nigerian army spokesman Sani Usman said suspected elements of the group who were foraging for food had ambushed troops escorting the commercial vehicles from Damboa to Maiduguri, a journey of around 50 miles (80 km).

"Unfortunately, five civilians lost their lives at the incident and another died on the way to the hospital," said Usman.

Three soldiers also sustained injuries." Boko Haram controlled a swathe of land in northeast Nigeria around the size of Belgium at the start of last year, but has been pushed out of most of that territory by the Nigerian army, aided by troops from neighbouring countries.

The militants have nevertheless continued to carry out suicide bombings in northeast Nigeria and neighbouring Cameroon, Niger and Chad.

On Saturday, Niger said its soldiers and Chadian troops had killed 38 Boko Haram fighters. Reuters

CLINTON ACCUSES TRUMP OF HELPING ISIS RECRUIT FIGHTERS

PHILADELPHIA – Democrat Hillary Clinton on Monday accused Republican rival Donald Trump of helping Islamic State militants recruit more fighters as bomb blasts in New York and New Jersey made national security a top concern on the US presidential campaign trail.

Trump, meanwhile, said Clinton's "weakness" while Democratic President Barack Obama's secretary of state had emboldened terrorists worldwide to attack the United States.

Both candidates tried to use the attacks to flex their national security credentials, with world leaders gathering in security-heightened New York for the annual United Nations General Assembly.

Clinton said Trump's rhetoric against what he calls "radical

Islamic terrorism" is helping Islamic State, also known by the acronym ISIS.

"We know that a lot of the rhetoric we've heard from Donald Trump has been seized on by terrorists, in particular ISIS, because they are looking to make this into a war against Islam rather than a war against jihadists," she told reporters in White Plains, New York.

The Trump campaign responded by saying Clinton bears some

responsibility for the violence by not persuading Obama to leave a residual force of US troops in Iraq when she was his secretary of state from 2009 to 2013.

Obama and the Iraqi government failed to reach agreement at the end of 2011 on extending a US Iraqi status of forces agreement, and most American troops were withdrawn.

Trump has sought to tie Clinton to the decisions of the Obama administration.

"Hillary Clinton's weakness while she was secretary of state has emboldened terrorists all over the world to attack the US, even on our own soil. They are hoping and praying that Hillary Clinton becomes president so they can continue their savagery and murder," Trump said on Facebook. He did not give specifics. *Reuters*

Bombing suspect 'wanted visa for wife'

NEW YORK - A New Jersey congressman says the Afghan immigrant arrested in the New York-region bombings contacted his office from Pakistan in 2014 to help get his pregnant wife a visa. Rep. Albio Sires said that Ahmad Khan Rahami emailed his office from Pakistan in 2014 seeking help because his wife had an expired Pakistani passport. Sires said his office wrote a letter to the US embassy in Pakistan to check on the status of the case and that the woman eventually received a visa. He says he doesn't know if she ever came to the country and the FBI didn't answer when asked on Monday. Sires says he contacted the FBI about the encounter on Monday after Rahami was named as a person they were seeking for questioning.

28 000 teachers fired in Turkey

ANKARA – Turkey has fired almost 28 000 teachers and suspended more than 9 000 others for suspected links to the failed July coup and Kurdish militants, Deputy Prime Minister Nurettin Canikli said Monday. Hours after some 18 million children finished their first school day since the July 15 coup bid, Canikli said a total of 27 715 had been dismissed from the profession this summer.

Merkel admits mistakes on refugees

Merkel pledged Monday that there would be no repeat of last year's "chaotic" border opening to refugees, after a stinging loss for her party in Berlin elections. Even as she defended the "political and ethical" decision to let in one million asylum seekers in 2015 in the face of a potential humanitarian catastrophe, Merkel admitted mistakes that she would avoid in future.

"If I could, I would turn back time many, many years to better prepare myself, the federal government and all those in positions of responsibility for the situation we were rather unprepared for in the late summer of 2015," Merkel said.

"That's our Syrian refugee problem," said the post, which caused a stir and negative tweets on the internet into yesterday.

Young Trump's tweet said,

"This image says it all. Let's end the politically correct agenda that doesn't put America first."

His father has advocated sharply restraining immigration and has accused opponent Hillary Clinton of advocating acceptance of tens of thousands of refugees.


Florida declares neighbourhood Zika free

FLORIDA – US health officials on Monday urged pregnant women to consider putting off non-essential travel to Miami due to the Zika virus even as they lifted a travel warning for one neighbourhood.

Earlier in the day, Florida's governor declared the neighbourhood of Wynwood Zika-free and invited visitors to return.

The Centres for Disease Control and Prevention left in place a travel warning issued on August 19 for nearby Miami Beach even as it discontinued one issued on August 1 for Wynwood due to local transmission of the mosquito-borne virus that can cause serious birth defects.

"We want to continue to emphasise to pregnant women that they still should consider postponing non-essential travel for all of Miami-Dade (County). That is still in effect," CDC spokesman Tom Skinner said. AP



NICE - Mario Balotelli chose Nice over a move to Champions League side Lyon this summer, according to the French club's president.

The Italian striker was left short of options after Jurgen Klopp made it apparent that his Liverpool career was over, eventually signing for Nice on the final day of the transfer win-

But Nice President Jean-Pierre Rivere says Lyon, who finished second last season and have started this season with a win in the Champions League, were also in for the striker come deadline day.

"Yes, Jean-Michel Aulas (the Lyon president) has attempted to recruit Balotelli," Rivere told L'Equipe. "I learned the day before but it's okay, it's part of

the game. "Signings like Younes Belhanda and Balotelli, you want to do in June but it is not affordable. So you prepare, you work and try to finish at the

Balotelli has made a good start to life at Nice, with the club second in Ligue 1, and ahead of champions PSG by a point.

Had he gone to Lyon he would probably be behind striker Alexandre Lacazette in the pecking order, while at Nice he has started twice, scoring a brace on his debut.

Despite picking up two silver medals, one race in particular stood out for the South African - his podium-less performance in the 200m butterfly. It was the event in which he was the defending champion after

trumping Michael Phelps in London in 2012. Unfortunately for the 24year-old, he had to be consolidated with a fourth place finish in 1:54.06, as Phelps picked up his gold with a time of 1:53.36. Soon after the race, a heartbroken Le Clos was unable to face the media and walked past the group of South African journalists waiting for his comment.

Eventually, Le Clos admitted he wanted to cry, but didn't, with his dad

Bert saying: "Le Clos' only cries when we win. We don't cry when we lose." In an interview with YOU Magazine, the Olympic medallist said the 200m race was one he'll regret for the rest of his life. A little more than two weeks after competing at the Rio Games, Le Clos bounced back by winning 200m butterfly gold in the FINA Swimming World Cup legs in Paris, Berlin and Moscow. Nadal, Farah defend medical records after latest hack

LONDON, UNITED KINGDOM Rafael Nadal and British Olympic great Mo Farah said they have nothing to hide after their medical records were the latest to be leaked by a cyber-hacking group on Monday.

They are among more than 60 international athletes, including 17 from the British team at the Rio Olympics, who have had their medical files -mostly therapeutic use exemptions (TUEs) - published online by the socalled Fancy Bears, who have hacked into World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) records.

There is no suggestion that any of the named athletes - among them some of the biggest names in sport have done anything wrong.

Spanish tennis ace Nadal and fourtime Olympic champion distance



runner Farah were shown to have used TUEs in the past to gain permission to take substances that figure on WADA's banned list.

TUEs can be issued to athletes who have an illness or condition that requires the use of normally prohibited medication. "When you ask permission to take something for therapeutic reasons and they give it to you, you're not taking anything prohibited," Nadal, a 14-time Grand Slam winner, told Spanish media.

The current streak bettered a Real record which had stood for 35 years. Miguel Munoz's 1960-61 team enjoyed 15 victories on the bounce.

"It's nice to get the record - it comes from the work all the lads are doing, they're doing phenomenally," Zidane said.

"The most important is to keep picking up points, as La Liga is very long." *Dailymail*

Wawrinka needs to be 'more consistent'

NEW YORK- US Open winner Stan Wawrinka needs to be more consistent to go up to the next level, according to his coach Magnus Norman.

The 31-year-old Wawrinka has been coached by Swede Norman since 2013 and together have won three grand slam singles titles: the 2014 Australian Open, 2015 French Open, and the 2016 US Open. He ended significant losing streaks against Rafael Nadal and Novak Djokovic as well as earning rare wins over Swiss compatriot Roger Federer.

In an interview, Norman acknowledged the one problem with his charge was that Wawrinka was very up and down in 2016 losing in the Australian Open third round and in the second round at Wimbledon along with several other upsets in



tournaments. "(He's) very much up and down and that's something we

work on every day, more or less every day," Norman said. "Still haven't found really the key, (the way) he can be a little bit more consistent. But when he's on, when he's playing a lot of matches, I think he's tough to beat." Norman added that he felt that world No. 3 Wawrinka had the weapons, when he was onsong, to defeat world No. 1 Djokovic more often just like he did in the US Open final recently.

Ancelotti wants long Bayern stay

BAYERN - Ahead of tonight's top-of-the-table Bundesliga clash at home to Hertha Berlin, Bayern Munich coach Carlo Ancelotti says he has found a true 'family' at the Bavarian giants.

"There are clubs which feel like a business and clubs which feel like a family. Here, it's a family," the Italian, who has coached at Paris Saint-Germain, Chelsea, AC Milan and Real Madrid, said at the launch of his autobiography in Munich.

"I want to remain here more than two years," he added, although he has a three-year contract which expires in June 2019.

Ancelotti replaced Pep Guardiola as Bayern's head coach this season.

He has steered the Munich giants to the club's best start this season with a perfect record of six wins from six, scoring 23 goals and conceding just one.

He has already lifted his first silverware, when Bayern won the pre-season German Super Cup at Borussia Dortmund last month.

His main task will be achieving what Guardiola failed to do in his three-year tenure - winning the Champions League, a feat Ancelotti achieved with both AC Milan and Real.

Second-placed Hertha and league leaders Bayern are the only teams in Germany's top flight with 100 percent records after the first three matches ahead of the Allianz Arena clash.

Hertha have lost their last nine league matches in Munich and last posted a Bundesliga victory in the Bayarian capital in 1977.

Bayern welcomed back Philipp Lahm, David Alaba and Mats Hummels from illness in yesterday's training session, while Thomas Mueller returned on Monday. All four missed Saturday's 3-1 comeback win against Ingolstadt.

Ancelotti revealed Bayern defender Jerome Boateng will make his first start of the season after coming off the bench late on against Ingolstadt.

The centre-back picked up an injury at June's European championships when Germany lost in the semi-finals to France.

"He will start, I think he's ready." Winger Arjen Robben is set for his first appearance, but only off the bench, "but he'll come on for the second-half, he can play 54 or 30 minutes," added Ancelotti.

Guardiola blasts Toure agent

MANCHESTER - Pep Guardiola says Yaya Toure will not feature for Manchester City until he receives an apology for Dmitri Seluk's recent outbursts in the media.

Guardiola left Toure out of his Champions League squad for this season and Goal understands City were keen to move the Ivorian on if they could find a willing buyer in the summer transfer window.

Seluk, Toure's agent, told the press a day after his exclusion from that squad that the decision "humiliated" his client, and that "if City don't win the Champions League then I hope Pep has got the balls to say he was wrong to humiliate a great player like Yaya." Guardiola, however, has not taken kindly to the comments, and said on the eve of City's League Cup clash with Swansea City that Toure will play no part, and that he can

expect to be left out until the Toure camp reaches out to the City boss and his players to make amends.

"It was so difficult for me to put him out in the Champions League," Guardiola said. "So difficult. I know him, I know he's a good good guy, but it was difficult for me as well to put Aleix Garcia out, [they are] the only two players that are out, because the list is the list.

"But the day after his agent spoke. In that moment Yaya is out. Until Mr Dmitri Seluk comes back in the press conference, or his friends in the media, [until] he has the courage to call me, or go to the media and say he apologises to Manchester City, the first one, the second one is his teammates and after the trainer.

"When that happens, Yaya will be part of the group and he will have the same chance to play all the games.

Because I cannot accept, as a coach,

every agent when his player doesn't play goes to the media and speak and speak and speak and speak and speak." I know how Dmitri Seluk loves Yaya Toure, if he loves me, show me and apologise to Manchester City what he did in the [media]. I cannot imagine in my period when I was a football player, my manager going to the media and speaking against Johan Cruyff, about this and about that." *Goal*







FA wants License A coaches next season



SOCCER - THE National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) will implement a programme that will require local coaches to have License A for them to be eligible to lead a Premier League team next season.

Only the assistant coaches will be allowed to have License B in the elite league.

NFAS CEO Frederick Mngomezulu said initially they wanted all the PLS coaches to have a Pro License but they could only implement that if current License A holders were over 30.

Only 22 local coaches have License A and currently there is no local coach, who holds a Pro

License. Mngomezulu said teams should be spoiled with options as far as getting a coach is concerned hence they couldn't implement the Pro License because 22 people is not enough

a number for them to put the programme into practice.

"We want to implement the standards in the lower divisions, especially at the Super League so that they take the culture with them to the top league. We are training individuals from each lower division team so that by the time they get promotion, they have acquired the necessary paperwork. We are going for Pro License in the elite league in future and those holding License B will mentor the Premier League Reserve League," he said.

First Division teams' head coaches and their assistants will have to hold License B to be eligible from next season. License B holders will be required to have License C. Pro License will be introduced in 2018, as per CAF regulations.

...Foreign coaches should be better than Swazis

SOCCER - THE Football
Association has made a recommendation to local
teams, who opt for foreign
coaches to go for individuals
that are more qualified and
have the necessary paperwork.

CEO Mngomezulu said they would remain strict on regulations guiding coach's requirements and it would help local teams to go for the best and qualified tutors if they decide

to look outside of the country.

"We do need foreign coaches in the country because they bring that African feel and even international football.

What we don't recommend is for clubs to hire foreign coaches without making proper inquiries about their qualifications as we would remain strict with the necessary paperwork required of elite league coaches," he said.

Currently, there are four foreign coaches in the local elite league. Mbabane Highlanders are under the guidance of Malawian born Meck Mwase while Correctional Services side is mentored by Zimbabwean Herbert Maruwa. PLS rookies Tambuti are led by Alou Badara from Mali while Manzini Sundowns is coached by Godfrey Tamerepi from Zimbabwe.

This coming Saturday, the team will be looking for their first victory in the campaign when they face-off with Moneni Pirates at Mavuso Sports Centre.




