


The King said it was his dream to have Swazi teachers who would be part of the university's team of lecturers and advised that teachers should work hard in seeing the university which is expected to be established in the country, having Swazis as lecturers. Speaking during the graduation ceremony for William Pitcher College yesterday, His Majesty said with Swaziland having taken over chairmanship of the SADC and the university launched in the recent SADC Summit, this effectively means the country should prepare teachers for the university.

He said technology is one of the things the country should put first since it has a positive impact on the economy and these effectively means that Swaziland should produce more students in the field of science and biotechnology.

In turn these students will also be able to manage the under construction Science and Biotechnology and Innovation Parks.

His Majesty said since independence, the nation has always made sure that education is availed to all citizens and for those who did not get the opportunity to go to school, adult education like Sebenta was introduced stating that this shows how much government is convinced that the economic growth of the nation lies in equipping the people with appropriate skills meet the requirements of the 21st century.

The King said he was happy to learn that the college has been equipped with an Information Communication
Department which is a critical element in the century since ICT plays an integral part in the economic development of any country and pleased to learn that students are provided with the necessary ICT skills.

King unveils E3m King Somhlolo giant sculpture

is Majesty the King yesterday was all smiles as he officially unveiled a massive sculpture of the late King Somhlolo before naming the Jubilee Park, King Somhlolo Park.

Manzini came to a standstill as the King arrived at the park situated next to the Post Office along Nkoseluhlaza Street yesterday morning.

The giant statue depicting the late king carrying the holy Bible as his vision for the country to opt for the Bible over money was unveiled by His Majesty before he proceeded to officiate at the William Pitcher College Graduation ceremony held at the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre.

The King said yesterday was quite a significant day in that he was able to unveil the statue within the city centre as the giant bronze sculpture captures the great vision of the late king which he shared with the Swazi nation thus encouraging Swazis to choose the Bible over money.

He said it was this vision that has helped the country shape the foundation of its society as a predominantly Christian people, urging Swazis to keep the vision alive wherever they go.

Manzini businessman Mphilo Nhlebela of Intel Park, a company managing the Manzini City parking system, is the brains behind the noble idea.

Nhlebela said this was a fouryear project which however took six months to curve the sculpture.

He said after having dreamt of having something to identify Manzini with, he came up with the



project of having the late King Somhlolo's sculpture since the Jubilee Park is also used by Christians to hold Lunch Prayer Services each day.

"I am happy this dream has been eventually realised and I would like to thank the City Council for having trust in me and assisting in the manner they have," Nhlebela said.

Upon arriving at the park, the King was met by the mayor councilors and City Council management before unveiling the sculpture.

The sculpture is placed near the main entrance of the park facing the Lebombo building and will now be a major tourist attraction for both domestic and international tourism.

It is placed on a large boulder that took 21 days to be removed from the Mdzimba Mountain near LaMgabhi area.


The King said the graduates should be masterminds in the teaching profession by making sure they impart meaningful knowledge to the pupils they would be teaching.

Children, according to the King, spend more time with teachers than parents hence he urged the graduates to play the parental role of impacting not

only educational, but also life skills to the children as they grow up.

He said the graduates have been given the treasure of the nation to teach and develop to be responsible citizens stressing that the nation was looking upon teachers to uphold their teaching ethics.

To the lecturers, the King urged them to work very hard as they look forward in offering more programmes since the college is one of the oldest in the country having been established in 1962, meaning it turned 54 years old this year.

The King said with education the country's economy could be turned around since this was a major stimulus for economic growth.

He related to the hundreds of well-wishers, graduates and members of the public how when travelling around the world, he would pose a question to some of the leaders on how they managed to have their countries achieve first world status.

He said most of the leaders stated they invested a lot in education which worked quite well for them in attaining the first world status.

Knowledge

Developing

This, the King said, was aimed at making sure that pupils and students within the country's learning institutions are at par with the developing world in terms of technology and other educational theories.

JSW Energy brings E7bn thermal plant

he fruits of His Majesty King Mswati III's visit to India just about the same time last year is bearing fruits as JSW Energy Limited, a subsidiary of the JSW group of companies, has brought good news to the country.

The company of Indian origin yesterday laid its cards on the table by disclosing it is bringing a massive investment of about E7 billion (US\$500 million) to establish the first ever thermal power plant in the country.

This was during a landmark occasion of the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) graced by a team led by the Prime Minister Barnabas Sibusiso Dlamini, a team from JSW led by Managing Director (MD) Sanjay Sagar and Swaziland Electricity Company (SEC) acting MD Meshack Kunene at the Cabinet Offices last evening.

The ultimate output from the MoU will see JSW building a thermal power station, using Swaziland coal to generate electricity which they will sell to the sole buyer, SEC.

The PM, making his remarks at the function, observed that the signing of the MoU between government, SEC and JSW Energy Limited was truly historic. ...In momentous occasion overseen by the prime minister at the Cabinet offices last night, Indian company signed MoU with government and SEC

He highlighted that the MoU has come following meetings that have taken over eight months adding for now a business plan and a feasibility study were still to be developed to ensure that the project is a success.

Development

"It is an MoU which, when the subsequent agreements are operationalised, will perhaps rank as the catalyst of all catalysts in the future economic development of our country. The project will usher in an exciting transition into Swaziland's self-sufficiency in

electricity generation. This has not come a day too soon but we must bear in mind it is not a short term remedy. It will take a number of years to take today's MoU to the point of thermal power delivery to the Swaziland grid.

Only then will be the moment that we can remove the dependency that is no longer a satisfactory solution to meeting our power requirements," he said.

The prime minister went on to highlight that during the Africa-India Summit last year, His Majesty was able to explore the possibilities of investor interest in constructing the thermal power station that is extremely needed in the country.

He said owing to logistical limitations, the King could not make a personal visit, but instructed the PM, the Minister of Natural Resources Jabulile Mashwama, Agriculture Minister Moses Vilakati and Economic Planning and Development Minister Prince Hlangusemphi to inspect the operations of JSW Energy.

"After graciously hosting the Swazi delegation, JSW Energy collaborated extensively in the planning process that has culminated in the MoU.

We are immensely proud that we will be working with a company of such experience, in the vanguard of thermal power generation in the world, and from the industrial and commercial powerhouse that is India today.

This will be a partnership that will unlock and utilise to optimum productivity of our main mineral resource, namely coal, and deliver us into a power self-sufficiency that we could hitherto only dream about," added the PM

Cabinet ministers present during the signing of the MoU were Prince Hlangusemphi who represented the natural resources and energy minister and Minister of Home Affairs Princess Tsandzile.

SD forever grateful for SA, Moza power

he Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini has expressed the country's gratitude to its neighbours, South Africa and Mozambique for their support as the country depends on them for power supply.

With the impact of the drought, the country has been forced to the limit and now depends 100% on external power from South Africa's ESKOM and Electricidade de Moçambique (EdM) from Mozambique.

He said he trusts the support that has been extended to the country to the present day will continue as Swaziland develops its new project.

"In the meantime, with the impact of the drought ratcheting up our external power dependency to 100% we must recognise and adapt appropriately to meet the challenging times of the short term. Building the thermal power station does not mean we are ignoring the development of other forms of energy generation. Renewable energy, and other alternatives to

thermal power sources, are the way the world must, and will, go," he said.

The PM revealed that the country was already pursuing a policy of encouraging independent power producers, mainly in renewable energy, to set up their own generation facilities and supply the SEC.

He said this was a strategy to which the majority of countries in the world were committed.

"For Swaziland, we see the way forward as two forms of power generation - thermal and renewable - working in parallel with each other into the foreseeable future, meeting our power needs while utilising a valuable raw material for the thermal power station that will be built. It remains for me to express our deepest gratitude to JSW Energy for taking on, and financing, this very substantial project, and I reiterate Swaziland's commitment to the partnership that is being launched within the MoU we are signing today," he added.

JSW assures transformation in country's power generation

about transformational changes in the country's electricity grid.

JSW Managing Director (MD) Sanjay Sagar yesterday assured that the proposed investment of approximately US\$500 million by the JSW Group in Swaziland would serve as a harbinger of foreign direct investment in the kingdom that is now set to

ment in the kingdom that is now set to become the favoured investment destination in this part of the world. "JSW would like to express its sincere

gratitude to His Majesty King Mswati III and the government for giving us the opportunity to contribute in the nation's journey towards self-reliance in electricity. I look forward to the day when we will not only provide affordable electricity for Swaziland but will also make this nation a net exporter of electricity to its neighbours, while simultaneously creating job opportunities for its people," he added.

Meanwhile, JSW Group is said to be a US\$11 billion (about E151 billion) conglomerate that is part of the O.P. Jindal Group and has strong footprints across various sectors namely, steel, energy, minerals, port, infrastructure and cement in multiple locations across India, US, South America and Africa with a workforce of over 38 000.















CJ contradicts his own judgment

In January 2010, Chief Justice
Bheki Maphalala dismissed an
application whose substance challenged the Prevention of Corruption
Act, in particular the ex-parte application and order granted by then Justice
Richard Banda (former CJ).

The application had been made by then SPTC MD E.Nathi Dlamini.

The order authorised his arrest and ordered that he be taken to the Mbabane Police Station and thereafter to the Magistrate's Court for a remand hearing.

A warrant of apprehension was issued by the Registrar of the High Court in pursuance of this order.

Dlamini was arrested and granted bail in the sum of E500 and was required to surrender his passport.

Interestingly, before the matter went to Appeal, the Chief Justice Maphalala (now) had dismissed the application by Dlamini, arguing that former Chief Justice Richard Banda had rightly granted an ex-parte application which was sought by the ACC.

Justice Maphalala, in his judgment then, dismissed Dlamini's application arguing that the former chief justice had correctly granted the application.

"I am in no doubt that His Lordship the chief justice in granting the warrant of arrest exercised his discretion judicially. In the circumstances, I am of the considered view that the Warrant of Arrest against the Respondent (Dlamini) was lawfully obtained and the application to have it set aside cannot succeed," he said in his judgment.

Justice Maphalala said Section 162
(5) provides that the director (Director of Public Prosecutions) may exercise these powers directly or by subordinate officers acting in accordance with the general or special instructions of the Director

He said Section 162 (6) provides: "In the exercise of the powers conferred under this chapter, the director shall: (b) be independent and not be subject

to the direction or control of any other person or authority."

He said the Constitution has given the director wide–ranging powers to institute criminal proceedings against any person in respect of any offence alleged to have been committed by that person against the laws of Swaziland.

"In exercising these powers, he is independent and not subject to the direction or control of any other person or authority. When instituting the criminal proceedings against the Respondent, the director acted lawfully and within her powers enshrined in the

Respondent, the director acted lawfully and within her powers enshrined in the Constitution. The court cannot and will not interfere with this power. All that a court can do when an accused person

is arraigned before it is to decide whether or not the state has proved its case against the accused person beyond reasonable doubt. In addition, the court has the power to decide on the validity of the charge or indictment in the event of an objection and/or challenge to it from the accused person. Otherwise, the court cannot prevent or instruct the director not to institute criminal proceedings against a person or compel him to withdraw a charge and/or indictment preferred."

He went on to quote Section 162 (4) (c) of the Constitution provides that:

"The director shall have the power in any case in which the director considers it proper to do so, to discontinue, at any stage before judgment is delivered, any criminal proceedings instituted or undertaken by the director or any other person or authority ..."

In dealing with an ex-parte application, the CJ then said the order issued by Justice Banda was final in nature.

"Every application brought ex-parte by way of petition or notice of motion shall, save in matters of urgency, be filed with the registrar and set down not later than midday on the court day proceeding the day on which the application is to be heard."

"Any person having an interest which may be affected by a decision on an application being brought ex-parte, may deliver notice of an application by him for leave to oppose," he said.

He said it is common cause that the applicant (Commission) herein did not cite Dlamini as the Respondent nor did they serve him with the application prior to the granting of the order.

"Similarly, it is true that His Lordship did not issue a Rule Nisi with a return day to allow Dlamini to file opposing papers and be heard before the order was made. However, this Rule does not assist a person who is confronted with an order obtained ex-parte since the Rules do not afford him an opportunity to be heard. Only a person who learns of the ex-parte application prior to the hearing may deliver notice of an application for leave to oppose supported by an affidavit setting forth the

nature of his interest in the matter and the grounds upon which he desires to be heard," he said.

Justice Maphalala said he was not aware of any decision of the Supreme Court or High Court of Swaziland on this point.

"However, there are a number of cases decided in South Africa on this point, and there is no doubt in my mind that they reflect the law in this country," he said.

Judge Maphalala said the order obtained by Applicant ex-parte was provisional in nature and once it is contested, the court was obliged to reconsider it afresh.

"Clearly, an ex-parte order cannot stand on the way of the Principle of "Audi Alteram Pattem"; this is a fundamental principle of our law which is the cornerstone of our justice system. It ensures justice and fairness and the equality of all persons before the law. Every person who has a direct and substantial interest in a matter should be heard before a final decision is made."

He said Dlamini in his prayers sought in the amended Notice of Motion are:

(a) That the warrant of apprehension (arrest)

issued by this honourable court on 31st July 2009 authorising the arrest of the First Respondent in terms of Section 13 (1) (a) of the Prevention of Corruption Act No. 3 of 2006 be and is hereby set aside.

(b) That the order of the Subordinate Court for

the district of Hhohho under Case No. 444 of 2009 imposing bail conditions upon the First Respondent's release from custody under the aforesaid warrant be and is hereby set aside;

(c) That the said warrant of arrest be and is

hereby declared to have been unlawfully obtained;

(d) Conditionally, that Barry Heselsteiner be joined as Second Respondent;

(e) That the applicant, alternatively the Second

Respondent, be ordered to pay the First Respondent's costs on an attorney and own client scale;

(f) That the costs include the costs of two counsel

and that counsels' fees be certified in accordance with Rule 68;

(g) That further or other relief be granted."

He said ordinarily, a complaint is lodged to the Commission by any interested person; thereafter, the Commissioner appoints an investigating officer where it appears to him that an offence under this Act may have been committed.

Six years later, CJ changes tune

he Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala appears to have had a change of heart when dealing with an exparte application by the Anti-Corruption Commission.

Six years later, the CJ rules an almost similar case differently, despite the facts appearing to be the same.

He said the following in his ruling last week: "The application to enter and search premises in order to seize property and consequently effect an arrest is brought ex-parte without notice to the person under investigation. If the application succeeds, the investigating officer, together with other officers from the Commission as well as police officers, will enter the said premises without notice, conduct

the search on the premises, motor vehicles, receptacle, offices, residences and business premises of the person under investigation and consequently have the person arrested.

"Sections 11, 12, and 13 of the Act undermine and contravene the principle of *audi alteram* partem, with regard to the entry and searching of premises as well as the seizure of property, and, the consequent arrest of the person being investigated.

The powers of the Commission in this regard are far-reaching and have a devastating effect on the dignity of the person being investigated.

The right of the individual against arbitrary search or entry into the premises is undermined."

Supreme Court dismissed ex-SPTC MD application

The Supreme Court in dismissing Dlamini's application to reverse the warrant granted and his arrest, the court stated that Section 12(3) provides as follows:

"(3) Any person who - without reasonable excuse fails or neglects to disclose any information or to produce any accounts, books or documents required by an investigating officer under subsection (2); or obstructs an investigating officer in the execution of an authority made under subsection (1), commits an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty thousand Emalangeni or to imprisonment not exceeding five years or to both". The Supreme Court stated that it was against the background of these facts that Haselsteiner (investigator) sought the arrest of the appellant (Dlamini) in terms of Section 13(1) (a) of the Act.

"He did not serve the ex-parte application on the appellant "for fear that he might abscond and the whole purpose be defeated".

"The whole purpose of carrying out an investigation is to establish whether or not an offence has been committed. Only after such an investigation has been carried out can an offence, if any, be identified. What is clear is that the warrant for the appellant's apprehension was applied for and granted because of his alleged failure to comply with Section 12(3) of the Act in that he failed to produce the documents requested of him by the investigator. As a result of failure the investigator had every reason to believe that the appellant had committed an offence and it follows that in terms of Section 13(1) he had the powers to have him arrested."

The Supreme Court further stated that: "A complaint had been made to the Commissioner suggesting improper conduct on the part of the appellant. It seems to me that the Commissioner was, therefore, duty bound to carry out an investigation to determine the validity or otherwise the basis of the complaint. It is questionable, that at the outset; when the complaint was made to him that the Commissioner would have been

aware with certainty of the nature of the "offence" allegedly committed by the appellant. Only after the investigation had been carried out would the offence committed if any, be identified. He then did what was only proper in the circumstances. He called for an investigation to be carried out."

The Supreme Court's Justice Ebrahim who wrote the judgment stated: "Finally, I believe it would be useful to summarise the various sections of the Act to which I have referred, during the course of this judgment. In my view, an analysis of these provisions serves to emphasise the correctness of the conduct of the respondents in the manner they set about investigating the complaint made against the appellant; Section

8(1) provides for the appointment of investigating and other officers to assist the Commission in the performance of its functions;

10(1) (c) provides the authority to investigate any alleged offence or any other offence disclosed during such an investigation;

11(1) (c) provides the authority to call for documents in order to facilitate investigation;

12(1) gives powers to the Commissioner to authorise an investigator to source documentation in order to facilitate the investigation;

12(3) (a) & (b) are the provisions in terms of which an offence is committed for the failure to comply with the requests made by the investigator;

13(1) (a) provides the investigator with the power of arrest of an offender who is suspected of having committed an offence."

Justice Ebrahim said against the background of these legislative powers available to the respondents (Commission) and their proper use of these powers he was of the view that the former chief justice and Maphalala J came to the proper conclusions in their handling of this matter.

"Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed with costs including the certified costs of counsel."

CJ RULING GROUNDS ACC

Insiders have told the Observer on Saturday that last week's ruling by the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala has grounded the operations of the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

the Commission had established a prima facie case against the respondents for contravening Sections 21 41, 42 and 57 of the Act warranting their prosecution. The CJ held that

The chief justice was confronted with an ex-parte application for the entry and searching of premises, seizure of property and consequent arrest in terms of Sections 11, 12 and 13 of the Prevention of Corruption Act No. 3 of 2006 for former Commerce Industry and Trade Minister Gideon Dlamini, Fred Ngeri and Sindile Ngeri- nee Dlamini. The basis of the application was that investigations conducted by

the Commission had established a prima facie case against the respondents for contravening Sections 21, 23, 41, 42 and 57 of the Act warranting their prosecution. The CJ held that the applicant has failed to establish a prima facie case against the respondents they warranting the granting of the orders sought and dismissed the application.

"We are still stuck and nothing is happening in our offices since the ruling was made last week," one of the investigators told the Observer on Saturday. When the ACC PRO Jabu Phakathi was asked on this, she said at this stage have nothing to say on the matter and what is obtaining in their office. She said they wouldn't want to be quoted saying anything in relation to the matter. Attorney General Majahenkaba Dlamini also declined to comment.

"I wouldn't want to say anything since at one stage I may find myself called upon to deal with it, rather I keep my peace," he said.

Dlamini didn't want to be even drawn to comment on whether this ruling will be appealed, which appears right now obvious, saying he has nothing to say.

Swazi TV takes back Sigcoko's twin cab

n the latest development, financially strapped Swazi TV has taken back the luxurious grey Toyota Dakar four wheel drive bakkie. This morning, the car, which was recalled early in the week, is in Johannesburg running errands for station.

This is in the aftermath of a forensic audit of the financial affairs of the national broadcaster instituted by Parliament through the ministry of information, communications and technology. This is much against reports that the suspended chief executive officer was poised for a grand return to the station. The CEO had also been enjoying E10 000 per month transport allowance and also free fuel for transport over and above the vehicle.

In another development, it has been gathered

that the corporate affairs manager has been recalled to the ministry of labour following findings of the investigation whereby a number of managers were sent home on early retirement on the pretext the station was running at a loss yet hordes of other employers were hired on contract.

The corporate affairs manager had been on secondment to the station. Those who were hired after the retirement of the other managers have had their contracts not renewed.

However, officials at the station are reluctant to comment on the developments pending the tabling of the findings of the forensic audit.

The Public Enterprise Unit Quarterly Report, ending December 2015, "STVA is in financial crisis as it is not able to meet its financial obligations. The authority is in a financial mess that need government's intervention as it is rendered insolvent. STVA

Suspected rapists infected toddlers with STIs?

he 22-year-old man who is alleged to have sexually molested six young girls is alleged to have infected four with a sexually transmitted infection.

"There is evidence that the children were raped, at least a majority of them. More so, they all seem to carry a similar sexually transmitted infection.

I have read the statements of the witnesses and am of the view there is no doubt as to the link between the rapes of the children and the charge preferred on the accused," Nkosi said.

The judge said he had also received the social inquiry report compiled by Principal Social Welfare Officer Vierah Hlatshwayo from the deputy prime minister's office.

However, he was yet to go through it. He said, therefore, he was not going to pronounce whether or not he would admit the suspect to bail until he has read the report extensively.

He also stated he wanted to have the medical doctor to go before court in order to clarify certain aspects of the report which he could "My Lord I was surrounded by some of the relatives of the within the court premises. I felt intimidated because they were interfering with my duties. I am an officer of this court. May the court warn them to desist from this act," she said.

The judge warned them from disturbing Hlatshwayo in her work and stated that should anyone be reported and found to have interfered in her work, they would be arrested and charged with contempt of court.

Judge Nkosi stated Hlatshwayo had been sent to ascertain the mental state of the survivors of the alleged abuse.

"She is here to protect the rights of the children and that of the suspect," the judge said.

Opposing faction to seek audience with King on Qethuka's installation

Ithough they do not support the decision to install King's Praise Singer Qethuka Dlamini, as the acting chief of Sigombeni following the demise of Chief Lomngeletjane, the opposing faction has vowed not to run to the courts of law to seek redress on the matter.

Instead they will seek audience with His Majesty King Mswati III. The Dlakadla faction's spokesperson, speaking soon after news that Dlamini was introduced to Manzini Regional Administrator (RA) Prince Gcokoma by the faction behind him this week, he said in the country there were laid down and known procedures to be followed in such matters. He said it was wrong at inception to go to court pertaining to the matter as the King was the only authority to rule on traditional matters like this one.

"All we can do is seek audience with His Majesty to try and explain how things should have gone on the matter. We cannot go against what the King has already said so it just would not help and is not procedural to approach the court of law on the matter. As things stand there will be no peace until things are normalised on the matter," said the family spokesperson on condition of anonymity.

As the Sigombeni chieftaincy dispute rages on, the faction which supports the installation of Qethuka as the area's acting chief went

ahead to introduce him to the Manzini RA this week. They stormed Prince Gcokoma's office on Monday, where they told him they had made the decision to elect Qethuka in a family meeting held on October 10. However, the faction showed up alone at the RA's offices as the opposing side was nowhere to be seen.

When asked about the absence of the other faction, the RA stated he was not told as to why they did not show up.

According to Prince Gcokoma, the other faction was not present to oppose or support what was being relayed to him.

Prince Gcokoma said despite the disagreement between the two parties, he was told Qethuka had been appointed. He added that he cannot dwell much on the issue because he does not make decisions for people but he only acts as a messenger by taking messages, translating them and passing them to the elders and back to the people.

He said if what he has been told was being challenged by the other faction, he would call a second meeting and let the parties sort themselves out. Prince Gcokoma, however, advised the two parties to go back to their families and sort out their issues amicably. He said they would have to listen to each other according to their seniority positions and as a family council. He further pointed out that the unfounded accusations made by the factions against each other were not helping the situation but only creating animosity between them.




During the 36th Southern African Development Community (SADC) Heads of States and Government Summit held in the country, His Majesty launched the University of



10 YEARS IN PRISON, E100 000 FINE FOR POSTING EXPLOSIVES

- Prohibited items also include seditious communication, narcotic or psychotropic substance and radioactive material
- E50 000, five years in prison or both for hoax explosives postage

Sending explosives via mail is strictly prohibited, hence the Swaziland Postal Services Corporation Acts states that any person convicted on same shall be liable on conviction to 10 years in prison or a E100 000 fine or both.

According to Section 76 (4) of the

act, a person shall not send by post

or by private operator any explosives, flammable or other dangerous substances. The act also states that any article or matter which may expose a person to danger, or soil or damage other articles or property and equipment of the corporation or private operator is strongly prohibited. Meanwhile other prohibited items cited by the act include that of posting live animals and radioactive

material, any obscene or immoral article, importation or uttering of articles which is prohibited in the country of destination, any seditious communication or article and any communication which menaces a person.

Upon conviction, a person shall be liable to pay a fine of E30 000 or three years in prison or both for these offences.

Swaziland postal services to be an independent entity

Thad all along been known as the Swaziland Post and Telecommunications
Corporation (SPTC), however, an act yet to be tabled before parliament will now separate the parastatal into different entities with the postal services falling under a new corporation, the Swaziland Postal Corporation.

According to part two of the draft Swaziland Postal Services and Corporation Act 2016,

CORPORATION

under its constitution, powers, functions and structure, the new corporation, which is a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal which may sue and be sued and which may acquire, hold and dispose of movable and immovable property for

the purposes of the corporation.

The corporation shall, amongst others, have the power to do all things necessary and convenient to be done for the performance of functions, determine the prices of all goods and services, determine terms and conditions of the provision of its goods and services, issue licenses to any person for the use of postage franking machines and determine the conditions of such licenses.

The act allows the corporation to enter into contacts and agreements, including franchising agreements and determine the internal organisational structure of the corporation and the terms and conditions of employment of its staff.

Currently the postal services fall under the government parastatal, Post and Telecommunications corporation under the ministry of information communications and technology.

During the discussions held at the Royal Villas a week ago, it was also revealed that the new corporation shall have exclusive powers to issue

unbundling draft legisla-

tion validation unpacked that notwithstanding the fact that the corporation shall operate in a manner consistent with sound business practice, the minister responsible may acquire that government is afforded priority in the services delivered by the corporation and further provide a basic postal service that is reasonably acceptable to all people in the country at a single uniform rate of postage for standard letters conveyed within Swaziland.

In its operational structure, the board of directors appointed into the corporation, shall prepare and submit to the minister and annual business plan no later than four weeks before the commencement of each financial year, and a report on the implementations of the annual business plan not later than eight weeks after the end of each financial year.

Audited accounts of the corporation shall also be submitted not later than twelve weeks of after the end of each financial year with the business plan containing the nature and scope of operational activities, the nature financial structure, internal organizational structure and targets for profits, service performance and other key performance indicators.

The Swaziland Postal Services Corporation (SPSC) board of directors

The corporation shall have a board of directors including the managing director (MD) and these shall consist of individuals who have had experience in postal services, marketing, finance, or information and communications technologies and shall further have be appointed and replaced by the minister for information communications and technology (MICT) at any time after the Act had come into force.

The minister shall also appoint the chairman and deputy from amongst the directors and all directors other than the managing director shall hold office for a period not exceeding four years and shall be eligible for reappointment and may be anytime removed by the minister for a good and sufficient cause.

The board of directors shall consist of the following

- Chairman
- · Deputy chairman
- Managing director
- Not more than two directors

E50 000 FINE, FIVE YEARS IN PRISON FOR FORGED STAMPS

hose forging postal stamps shall fry as the new Postal Services Act provides that any person convicted for forging stamps shall be liable to a maximum penalty of five years in prison with a fine option to pay E50 000.

According to the general prohibitions in forgery, a person shall not forge a postage stamp, knowingly possess, sell, use or attempt to use forged stamps, knowingly possess any of the means of production of postage stamps, including the quality paper used for the production of postage stamps or alternatively produce postage stamps without the written approval of the corporation.

The prohibition shall, according to the act, extend to postage stamps of any other country, all stamps issues past and current and money order and other valuable postal stationery as if they were postage stamps.

Other revenue offences in as far as postal services are concerned, are that a person shall not reuse a postage stamp with intent to defraud, removed a postage stamp from a postal article, remove a cancelation mark from a postage stamp or knowingly possess a stamp from which the cancellation mark has been removed.

Others may be that which include the evasion of the due postage on any article posted by that person, sell a postage stamp



below its face or retail price except that the corporation may sell a postage stamp below its authorised agents at a price below its face or retail value and further more misappropriation or stealing any money of the corporation including money held by the corporation as a trustee or agent.

The same maximum sentence of five years and E50 000 fine option shall apply from these revenue offences.

In the event employees of the corporation are involved in revenue offences they shall be on conviction liable to a maximum penalty of three years in prison or a fine not exceeding E30 000, since they are not with intent to defraud, expected to issue a money order or any valuable stationary of the corporation, demand or accept postage or any other payment due to the corporation, fraudulently put an official mark on any postal article, or send by post or put into mail bag any article on which due postage has not been paid.

SPTC EMPLOYEES MAY APPLY FOR POSITIONS AT NEW ENTITY

ccording to Section 48 of the Swaziland Postal Services Corporation Act, the board may make appointments to all positions in the new postal corporation other than that of managing director, provided it may delegate the determination of such appointments as it decides to the MD or another officer of the corporation. The SPTC board of directors may determine terms and conditions on which early retirement may be offered to its employees in connection with the establishment of the new corporation and an employee of SPTC who accepts early retirement may be paid a separation gratuity under the terms determined by Section 48 and be paid a pension by the SPTC Pension fund or its successor in accordance with the terms determined with the relevant rules of the fund and also be paid by the SPTC in respect of any unused recreation leave entitlements. In

The act categorically states that a person shall not aid, abet, conspire or attempt to commit an offence in connection with postal services and any person convicted shall be liable to the full extent of the penalty prescribed for the relevant offence.

It has been revealed that every proceeding for the recovery of any postage or other sum alleged to be due under this act in respect of a postal article, the production of a

granting voluntary early retirement applications, the board may grant applications for such gratuity, or bonus shall be paid from the funds of the SPTC or such government funds as may be available for the purpose of such. Any former employee of the SPTC who will be employed by the new postal corporation shall be engaged on terms and conditions which are no less favourable than those which applied to him on the last day before the vesting date. At the vesting date, the corporation shall assume such responsibilities, liabilities and duties of the SPTC Pension Fund or its successor in respect of officers of the SPTC who eventually become employees of the new postal corporation, or as may be assigned to the corporation by the minister and as such employees shall continue to be members of the pension fund or any successor of the scheme.

postal article having an official mark of the corporation denoting that the article has been refused, or that the addressee is dead or cannot be found, shall be prima facie evidence of the fact so denoted, and unless the contrary is proven, the person from whom a postal article purports to have come from, shall be deemed to be the sender.

The corporation and its employees shall not be liable for consequences of any action under this part which has been performed in good faith.

NEW SPSC EMPLOYEES SHALL HAVE POWER TO OPEN, EXAMINE LETTERS

It has been noted that some postal clients use these services for conveying illegal substances in the form of drugs and other illegal substances and objects and the Swaziland Postal Services Corporation Act 2016 frowns upon such.

It is for that reason that the Act

provides for employees of the new postal services corporation that they shall have power to open and examine letters while carrying out their duties.

According to the Act, an employee of the corporation having been authorised by the MD, shall have the power to open and examine letters and alternatively an employee shall have the power to open and examine letters if so required by an order of court or law enforcement authority, under powers granted by prevailing legislation.



MANZINI COUNCIL WORKERS SCARED OF RETRENCHMENTS

mployees of the Municipal Council of Manzini are suspicious on the lack of adequate feedback about the restructuring and turnaround strategy implemented by management and label this as disguised retrenchment.

This transpired on Wednesday at the workers' lunch hour meeting held at the Zakhele Community Centre to relay feedback by union representatives on council's position regarding the retrenchments or turnaround strategy. They expressed dismay at being told management was in no position to state its position on the matter despite it was supposed to be handled through the negotiating table which recognises worker and employee representation. In a lacklustre atmosphere the workers were told the Chief Executive Officer Lungile Dlamini

would be the only one to provide direction and she would do so on her return, she is currently out of office. The use of the word bandlakhulu sparked murmurs in that the workers equated this to the Sibaya people's Parliament which is another provision for consultation at national level that works outside of industrial relations and the obligations per the labour laws.

Speaker after speaker insisted that

it would not be wise to deliberate further because already the CEO had sent word she would not be addressing the workers through their formations, the workers' union and the staff association but would do so directly and bypass all the structures. Some of them murmured the CEO was following on the footsteps of the Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority executive, her counterpart, by dealing directly with

stuff on matters that require union representation. This was further fuelled by the feedback report that management said it did not know what the CEO would say when she addresses the bandlankhulu, an exercise they said had failed to produce results in the past as was the standoff resulting in the CEO addressing the workers in last year's Christmas party which the workers had vowed to boycott.

"It is now a one man show, whether our concerns will be

addressed in this way is not certain, but what is certain is her will shall be imposed by decree. We had been expecting to resolve or address issues through dialogue. She has called us before where we raised our concerns but they were not addressed."

They say such meetings are mere smokescreen and no one can be held accountable for not committing to addressing concerns.

There was no date set for the CEO's return.

I STILL SAY BRING BACK THE E11.5M - MBHO

Iso sparking controversy among the council employees is the E11.5 million that was lost to a South African investment portfolio, an amount included E500 000 of employees' gratuity moneys.

Now that a number of the employees are approaching retirement age the municipal council is said to be running from pillar to post generating explanations on how it would return the lost moneys to the employees. They would rather not leave employment without the money.

Shongwe, a former senator and Manzini resident, revealed the E11 million was for capital projects and not to be invested in the first place, pointing an accusing finger at the councillors of the day and management who facilitated in investing money destined to repair roads and build infrastructure for the city in order for them to gain some interest for themselves. However the money went down the pyramid drain.

The E11.5 million erroneously invested in a pyramid scheme that collapsed in South Africa was a product of an Owen Nxumalo-led Council who was mayor at the time but now is Minister of Public Service. The money was channelled through a hastily formed local company that had branches in South Africa, Corporate Money Managers (CMM) whose directors included a person in management at council and the transfer was made possible through the assistance of the Central Bank of Swaziland which is now refusing to shed light on progress to recover the moneys.

Then Housing Minister Lindiwe Dlamini explained when the grants were introduced in 2007, all 12 cities had to share a small cake of E25 million with the distribution done according to population size. As a result, the city of Manzini was allocated the lion's share of E11.5 million, which was used for the upgrading of a number of roads in Ngwane



Park. In view of the good job that had been done, a further E11.5 million grant was released to the city of Manzini, which resulted in the upgrading of more gravel roads in a number of other townships.

However a scheme was designed to divert the money through CMM while council was still dealing with the tendering process which was expected to last three months. That was long enough to manipulate the process and divert the money into what was called a lucrative investment, when in fact it turned out to be a pyramid scheme. As soon as the money was transferred the pyramid scheme collapsed together with the E11 million and the E500 000 for council employees.

"We want the money to repair roads in the townships as it was destined for, now Manzini is slowly turning into a ghost town yet money from the taxpayers was made available. Promises that something was being done to recover the money are nothing but pep talk because the roads remain dilapidated yet money was allocated for their upgrading and maintenance." As if that was not enough those probing the transfer of the moneys also made a killing for themselves. Professor Musa Dlamini was allegedly paid E72 600 for chairing an inspection team that investigated the questionable investment of E11.5 million.

One member of his team got E63

000 for a job no longer than five weeks. Two civil servants were paid E57 000 and E63 000 each, respectively. The payments got blessings from then principal secretary Thembinkosi Mamba who instructed Ellena Wamnukoya then CEO in a November 10, 2009 letter. 'Please take appropriate steps to urgently pay as instructed in letter.'

Mxolisi Fakudze, an officer attached to the Ministry of Finance was paid E63 000 while his colleague Tini Chatterjee was paid E57 000 for the five-week job. Nobuhle Matsebula who worked for the attorney general chambers filed a claim of E46 327.16 and the least pay went to Isabel Ntuli, an employee of UNISWA who was paid E4 950.00. This gives a total of more than E243 000. "Please note transport costs have been excluded and will be submitted separately. Notwithstanding the above paragraph, you are directed to expediently pay these inspectors the stated amounts in view of the fact that they have completed and submitted the report to the Honourable minister in terms of Section 105 of the Urban Government Act and the minister had directed all costs of conducting the inspection shall be borne by council," it was reported. Council Public Relations Officer Mathokoza Thwala was since then barred from commenting on the E11.5 million issue.

Mysterious murders: No breakthroughs but cases not yet cold

irst it was the death of Swaziland Post and Telecommunications (SPTC) employee Funekike Gule who was found brutally killed at her landlord's premises, another was that of a school going girl who went missing while doing her laundry at Ngculwini and suspected to have been killed with her body mutilated and recently it has been the death of well-known Mbabane Magician Mduduzi Gama, who allegedly died at the hands of police officers.

Following these incidences, active investigations were launched by the Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSP) thus giving hopes to both the affected families of the deceased and members of the public in general that suspects would be brought to book and face justice.

Worrying

However, to date both these murder cases have still not been solved, leaving family, relatives, friends and members of the public worrying on whether these cases are still open or

This publication took the time to seek clarity from the country's trusted security service, the RSP on how these cases, especially that of Gule who died under a cloud of controversy, are being handled and where they really were.

The police explained that a case was not closed until it reached its finality, with arrests being made or a body of a missing person being discovered and such has not been located by the police. The nature of cases, according to the police, differ in terms of their investigations since some are easy to break while others take time as police follow whatever possible leads to no avail.

At times murder cases can take years due their complexity hence the police have appealed to members of the public to give them time in dealing with such cases since investigations may take longer than concerned relatives and the general public may have expected.

Investigation

Acting Police Information and Communications Officer (PICO) Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati, explained that with the case of the teenage girl who went missing at Ngculwini, investigations not closed yet.

Likewise that of the late Gule and the magician, the police are still investigating the murder cases hence they called upon members of the public who might be of assistance to help them with any information that might lead to arrests in these cases.

"We would like to assure members of the public, especially concerned relatives that as a police service, we are still investigating these cases. The police are actively investigating Gule and the Gama's murder cases and we also appeal to members of the public to assist with any information that may lead to arrests and breakthrough of these cases to call the police on the emergency number 999 or the nearest police station," Vilakati said. These not only applied to the above cases, but also others that have still not been solved by the police. All cases, according to the police, are given the priority they deserve hence such are not closed until arrests are effected. Dropped

Gule died under a serious cloud of controversy on Thursday April 17. 2014 just before the Easter weekend as she prepared to leave the country with colleagues, while the late magician died late last year after having been allegedly dropped by two uniformed police officers at Emvakwelitje. The late Gule's boyfriend had at some point alleged there were people involved in the somewhat unbreakable murder case.

Not only that, South African Koffi Makofane was also reported by our sister paper the Sunday Observer as also having blamed the media for not doing enough to solve Gule's alleged murder. He had over the last year been posting about the death of the late Gule and his last post had friends and family members trying to console him. She was supposed to have gone to her rented cottage at Checkers in

Mbabane to collect her belongings and then join her workmates on a trip to Lesotho.

However, she failed to return to their meeting place as she was later found naked and murdered under mysterious circumstances while lying in a pool of blood reportedly all over her rented flat. According to reports after her gruesome death, her unsuspecting friends and relatives went to the residence to look for her as they had waited for her longer than expected and she was reportedly also not responding to their calls. It is said on arrival, they found the gate locked but could see her car in its usual parking spot though she was not visible to them neither did she respond to their calls.

Frantically

This then caused them to frantically call for the Dlamini family members who they reportedly saw within the yard to open the gates to no avail.

Instead, the landlord, businessman Moses Dlamini is said to have entered the gate whilst barring them entry and lawyer Zweli Jele was also allowed into the homestead as he arrived shortly after him. Those who were at the gate at the time revealed that police later arrived and spent over five hours without telling them what was happening nor any medical intervention being made. Dlamini had revealed during an interview with the Observer on Saturday that Minister Winnie Magagula also made her way

to the gate to plead with the Dlamini relatives and the police to let Gule's family know what was happening to no avail. Gule was reportedly taken out of the Dlamini family compound at around 11:30pm to the hospital and only then was she certified dead. According to earlier reports from the Royal Swaziland Police Service Public Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Khulani Mamba, at that time, they were investigating whether Gule was mauled by dogs, could have been stabbed or shot. The post-mortem report was never availed to the family and they were barred from being there when it was conducted on Wednesday April 23, 2014.

Questioning Prior to her burial, one of Moses Dlamini's sons, Thulani and businessman Sandile 'Beyond 2000' Zwane were brought in for questioning by the police during the week leading to her burial The dogs, which belonged to the Dlamini family, were later put down after they allegedly bit their owner (Moses Dlamini).

Meanwhile, Gama, according to an eye witness, was dropped off by two uniformed police officers from a police van with multiple wounds at Emvakwelitje leaving him for dead.

Gama was later found lying helplessly near the tarmac and called for help with the eyewitness and residents later arrived at the scene and identified the deceased who was later pronounced dead upon arrival at the Mbabane Government Hospital.

LATEST TWIST IN TYCOON DUMISA SAGA'S ESTATE

In the latest development regarding the estate and status of hotelier mogul and sugar tycoon Dumisa Dlamini his son Mzwandile, reportedly being disowned by his siblings, would rather not waste time discussing DNA tests but wants to know the whereabouts of his father. However, if anyone would be interested he is ready to donate 10 litres of his blood for the testing and to add more litres from his four children if that would assist the doubting Thomases.

This follows recent media reports to the effect that some of Dumisa's children were disowning Mzwandile, saying he is an impostor. However, Mzwandile, has in his possession records of correspondences with those who have now turned to disown him. He also has telephonic conversations in which he was even asked whether he would stand as executor of the estate but refused on the grounds he was still not certain of the whereabouts of his father, whether he had

indeed died or was being held hostage somewhere for his possessions.

"What is preoccupying my crusade is not the distribution of my father's estate but to know his whereabouts, if he is dead let them show me and the rest of his children the grave and that must be confirmed. All his children have a right to his estate and to know what happened to him. All my father's children are welcome and no one must be left out in the determination of his condition and estate."

Mzwandile, while saying he has no time to waste responding to the call for DNA tests, says he wonders how any of Dumisa's children could have the guts to own siblings. "They are just

being childish, we should be coming together as a family to defend what is our own by first finding out what happened to our father before the rush to discuss his estate." He is prepared to die on the search path for his father's whereabouts without having to bother about his possessions.

He also discloses that some of those making noise have their mothers at Maphungwane living with a stepfather while others may not be known until they surface. They may be known by their mothers and the common father not for the siblings to determine who is Dumisa's legitimate or genuine child and who is not.

Details

He could not divulge further details of the status and size of the estate because he said he did not want to disturb police investigations into whether Dumisa had died or not and who was responsible for his burial. He insisted he was only reacting to public statements and putting them to their right perspective before disclosing that one of the girls now calling for the DNA tests literally lived with Mzwandile on Dumisa's property at Velebantfu, now Riverstone Mall in Manzini.

Last May, Mzwandile successfully interdicted the sale of one of his father's farm at Big Bend to SwaziBank. The farms were hastily put on auction for E11 million without the knowledge of the other children of the sugar tycoon. This was also before even the appointment of the executor of the estate if indeed Dumisa had died.

One Lot was Marshall Campbell, Portion 76 of Farm No. 161, Lubombo District and Portion 69 of Farm No. 161 Lubombo District, Swaziland, which measures 160 hectares. It is about one kilometre from Ubombo Sugar Mill.

The other is Matlock Estates, Portion 12 (a portion of portion 9) of farm Pircadie No. 457, Lubombo District, Swaziland

measuring 101. 2089 hectares. It is located near USA Distillers, about seven kilometres from Ubombo Sugar mill. Its water rights allows it to draw water from the Lusutfu River.

Pircadie Estates, the third farm, measures 31.4644 hectares. It is portion 9 of Farm Pircadie No. 457, Lubombo District and located near USA Distillers and approximately seven kilometres from Ubombo Sugar Mill. It has a four bedroom house (which needs attention).

Last year June, the same properties were put on auction and Mzwandile was first to raise dust but somehow the auctioneers resurfaced again this year to auction same properties. They had put a media notice that the farm was designated as comprising 10 hectares and sold for E950, which raised eyebrows because the farm in question is 101 hectares and is situated near USA Distillers in Mahlabaneni and therefore cannot fetch so little from the market.

Lawsuit

In 2001, the Absa Group woke up to a E126.8m lawsuit that July lodged against it in the Pretoria High Court by Swaziland sugar tycoon Dumisa Dlamini.

Dlamini was suing Absa for the collapse of his hotel empire in South Africa. In court papers filed on June 27, Dlamini claimed that Absa debited E12.7m from his account without authorisation. The bank was also accused of transferring E4.8m from Dlamini's loan account without authorisation. Dlamini further claims the bank failed to credit his account with E5.18m, which was deposited by Transvaal Sugar Limited (TSB), Barclays Bank of Swaziland and Van Rensburg and Meyer Attorneys Incorporated. It also allegedly failed to credit his account with E431 017 and then accused him of being in arrears with a loan repayment of half that amount and seized his property in



replace irrigation equipment at a cost of R24m because it was destroyed after the bank seized the property.

Dlamini was reported saying because Absa allegedly failed to service his accounts properly, he was deprived of funds to finance his other businesses and

E126.8m. Dlamini's hotel empire in the province crumbled because of unpaid services to municipalities and the non-payment of staff, it was claimed. Impala Hotel in Barberton was sold at an auction because Dlamini owed the Barberton Town Council E280 000 in rates and taxes.

The hotel had not operated for four years, after Dlamini bought it. He also bought the Phoenix Hotel in Barberton but its owners reclaimed it within a year when he failed to pay the full purchase price. Five other hotels in the province, Paragon, Figtree, Bambi, Wayside Inn and Montrose, were also closed down in 1997 due to unpaid electricity and water bills.

Dlamini owed the Nelspruit City Council more than Elm for unpaid bills at Paragon and Figtree hotels.

n the country contraceptives are made available to children as young as 12 years old. That is because government has an obligation to provide services. The only difference is these children cannot access the contraceptives at their respective schools, but must go to their

nearest clinics to get them. This was explained to the Editors Forum during a breakfast meeting at the Mountain Inn by Swaziland

National AIDS Programme (SNAP) Programme Manager Muhle Dlamini and National Emergency Response Council on HIV and AIDS (NER-CHA)'s Muziwethu Nkambule yester-

The meeting was in readiness for the Commemoration of the World AIDS Day 2016 with this year's theme being: 'Hands Up For HIV Prevention'.

Nkambule explained that the contraceptives are available to the children at the various clinics, but not at schools. This was after a question was posed on whether NERCHA was thinking along the lines of introducing these contraceptives to children so that if push comes to a shove and they decide to engage in sexual intercourse, they are not caught in the unfortunate situation of falling pregnant while still at school.

Nkambule disclosed that while statistics show that a larger proportion of children have delayed engaging in sexual intercourse with a reported 50-60%, some still engaged in the act.

He said the statistics showed that 80-90% children used condoms while at least 80% have reported condom use.

Responding to a question on whether sexual education is helping in schools, Nkambule highlighted that while an evaluation has not been made yet, there were signs of improvement.

He said through what they term lifeskills in the schools, the response from pupils has been tremendous as such interventions have delayed their sexual debut and most have responded to the call for circumcision.

GOVT DISTRIBUTING LUBRICANTS TO GAY MEN

n promoting greater inclusion and advocating for the provision of high-quality health and other services for the gay and lesbian community, government is providing, amongst other things, lubricants for use by gay people or males that have sex with men.

This is part of various interventions on the Lesbian Gay Bi-Sexual Transgender (LBGTI) Community. SNAP Programme Manager Muhle Dlamini said they had on various intervals engaged men who have sex with men in trying to get to know their lives and clients

"As part of our intervention, we are giving them lubricants for use. Here we use government money

and that from donors. So far we do not have evidence on HIV being transmitted by lesbians hence we have extensively worked with the gay community," he explained.

Still on interventions on LBGTIs, Dlamini disclosed that after getting information that sex workers were being harassed by police officers, they brought in a commandant from Ghana to come to the country and engage local police bosses. He said the Ghanaian was able to share his country's experiences and, "as we speak now, a number of sex workers have contact numbers of various station commanders so they can reach them if they are being abused."

ARVs, condoms could be repackaged

lready options are being weighed by stakeholders to repackage Anti-Retroviral drugs (ARVs) so that people taking

them are not discriminated.

Furthermore, there are ongoing discussions to improve the packaging of condoms so the general populace is

provided with better quality condoms whose use gives desired pleasure.

NERCHA's Muziwethu Nkambule vesterday disclosed that there were ongoing discussions at certain levels to repackage ARVs.

He said it was evident to all that the

current packaging was not fancied by their users hence one finds the containers are decorating bins at the various HTCs.



"Even WHO (the World Health Organisation) is considering it," he

said. It was revealed some children who are on Anti Retroviral Treatment (ART) have extensively complained about the packaging of the ARVs as they make noise when inside their bags resulting in them being stigmatised by their peers.

The 37 finalists contested for 16 categories which had a new category focusing on the young ones, The Maggie Eagles Young Journalist Award. Maggie was the CNN Executive and a former journalist who passed away in October last year and was the driving forces behind the development and growth f these awards.

Winning the first Maggie Eales Young Journalists award was Ancillar Mangena from Forbes Africa.

MultiChoice Africa CEO Tim Jacobs said this year's awards saw record entries from 38 across the continent.

"This is a testament to the strength of these awards and what they represent to African journalists, showing an appetite for Arica to tell its own compelling stories," he

CNN Executive Vice President and Managing Director for CNN International TONY Maddox said to be one of the 37 finalists from a record 1 600 entries is no mean feat.

It is a space worth watching even as we celebrate," she said.



SAMORA MACHEL WAS A NXUMALO



t has emerged Mozambique's first president Samora Moises Machel was in fact a Nxumalo with strong relations to the late former Cabinet minister and one time deputy prime minister Sishayi Nxumalo. He was remembered on Wednesday at Mbuzini on the South African side of the Mananga border post where a monument was erected in his honour at the site of the air crash that killed him together with 30 other members of his delegation on October 19, 1986. He was popularly known as Machel (Portuguese) Maxele (Xitsonga) and Mashele (Nguni or Sotho).

Machel's grassroots at Magude the Xitsonga version of Magudu, the royal enclave of the Nxumalos (also Ndwandwes, Ngunis or Mkhatshwas) at Zwide's homestead outside Phongola across the Lavumisa border, was a regular place of visit by Machel who was said to be fond of interacting with his look alike 'half brother'.

At the commemoration on Wednesday it transpired Samora comes from a powerful family in the Limpopo valley. His grandfather, Malengani (Magivelani) was a close friend of Magigwani Khosa. Malengani was in the same battalion as Magigwani, he was involved in the war against Bingwani. After

Bingwani's defeat at Bahule, Malengani was made a N*dhuna* by Nghunghunyani, in a land south of Limpopo just opposite Chayimiti.

History has it that Malengani was not 100% loyal to Nghunghunyani. He was more close to Nkuyu Nxumalo, a powerful man who was in favour of Mawewe who opposed Nghunghunyani with N'waMucinga, the rebelious anti-

Nghunghunyani Nxumalo princess.

As such, after the collapse of Gaza, Malengani did not run away with Mpisani. Malengani was related with the Nkuna, he was home. Malengani sired Mosi (Moises in Portuguese), who is the Father of Samora.

Samora was a Mozambican Nationalist, a Pan Africanist. His consciousness was beyond Tsonga ethnicism.

Though he was partly influenced by the local dynamics, such as his grandfather fighting in the 1895 war (The Fall of Gaza) between Gaza and Portuguese army.

Abolished

After independence, with Samora as president, all traditional Rule was abolished. Remember Samora was from a family that held tradi-

tional authority, so he knew very well what he was abolishing. Then in 1985, in a nationalist drive, he went to Portugal to demand the remains of Nghunghunyani. Not because Nghunghunyani was legitimised as a king of the Tsonga, but because he was historically recognised as an anti-colonial hero in a national and African history context. The remains were given to Samora, and are now lying in the Heroes' Acre in Maputo.

Nghunghunyani is declared a national hero among many others,

This has bolstered the ego of the Nxumalo in the context of present day Tsonga dynamics.


Hero

Nghunghunayani is a national hero in two countries — South Africa and Mozambique. With Soshangani's remains in Maputo Heroes' Square, and a statue in Giyani, it was through the manipulation of history (lobbying obvious) that a monument was erected at Soshangani's grave and declared a national historical site.

However, monuments, statues and avenues do not validate claims made on historical lies.

When Samora abolished traditional authority, it was based on his Marxist conviction.

He saw traditional authority as stumbling block to drive the country into social justice and development. In fact, he was right on that one. In less than 10 years, he had done much to develop the country but all was destroyed by the civil war, say his contemporaries.

number of international organisations have cited the drought as the reason for the weak economic growth of the country however an analysis of previous reports of the same institutions appears to point to the fact that Swaziland has been struggling for a number of years even before the drought.

The World Bank in its Macro Economic Report for Swaziland stated economic growth declined to 1.7 percent in 2015 from 2.7 percent in 2014 and now it stands at 0.9

"This was driven by declining Southern Africa Customs Union (SACU) revenues, adverse weather conditions caused by the El Nino phenomenon, and poor regional economic performance, especially in South Africa" the bank said.

The African Development Bank (AfDB) African Economic Outlook 2016 said prospects in Swaziland for increased economic growth in 2017 'remains poor.'

"Growth prospects can be on improved weather conditions and enhanced policy efforts to address critical challenges in areas such as the business climate and export diversification" reads the report as part

An economist from the local university who preferred to remain anonymous put forward another reason as to why the economy is sluggish.

"The negative investment growth is perhaps the single most critical factor that explains the weak economic performance of Swaziland," he said.

The lack of investment in the country was also noted by the Central Bank of Swaziland.

The Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) annual report 2015/2016 said, despite the efforts by government and her supporting structures to attract foreign direct investment (FDI) into the country, fresh FDI inflows still remain very low.

The bank said in light of the declining economic growth, high budget deficit and high unemployment levels; the country needs to intensify its efforts to attract fresh FDI inflows to address these challenges.

"Swaziland has a potential to attract fresh FDI into the mining sector considering her rich and diversified mineral deposit. It is wel-

comed development that government is currently working towards increasing the contribution of the mining sector to gross domestic product from the current level of 0.07 percent to over four percent by 2018," reads the report in part.

Also another factor that has been explored is the slow growth is as a consequnce of the slow economic growth in neighbouring South Africa.

University of Swaziland (UNISWA) economic lecturer and economist Sandile Khumalo

The economies of Swaziland and South Africa are very closley aligned such that poor growth in South Africa will result in poor growth in Swaziland.

This would seem to be true as currently even South Africa has very low economic growth.

Economy

"South Africa is Swaziland's largest trading partner and therefore a slow down in that economy will invariably lead to a slow down in the Swaziland economy," he said.

Swaziland has however another neibouring country which is Mozambique

University of Swaziland Lecturer and international relations analyst Dr Mark Chingono said there is limited tyrade between Swaziland and Mozambique.

"The Swazi economy is more reliant on the South African economy," he said.

Even if trade was notable between Swaziland and Mozambique, our neighbour is currently going through their own economic woes because of their crippling debt.

According to the South African publication Financial Mail, Mozambique is facing a foreign debt crisis after it admitted to secret government borrowing of E16 billion.

"The Mozambican government is currently going through a debt crisis that has seen the country having the largest debt burden in Sub Saharan Africa," the pulication said.

The global economy as a whole is currently growing at a very slow pace and given Swaziland trades with a number of other

countries it could be another reason why the economy is not doing well.

South African Minister of Finance Pravin Gordhan speaking at the International Monetary Fund (IMF) recently said the global economic recovery continues to disappoint and poses significant challenges to our goal of improving living conditions.

Gordhan was not only speaking on behalf of South Africa but also speaking on behalf of numerous African countries including Swaziland.

He said to reduce vulnerabilities to exogenous shocks inon the continent, economic diversification and transformation has been identified as a key development agenda for the region.

"In this regard, we welcome the on going pilot of the infrastructure policy support initiative that has seen fruitful engagement with the authorities as they look into enhancing public investment management. We look forward to its broader rollout in support of efforts to address infrastructure

We welcome ongoing efforts to help design consistent set of policies that allow for smooth adjustment and restoration of growth for low-income countries hit by commodity price shocks," he said.

Speaking of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), in its World Economic Outlook Report this October it forecasted Swaziland low economic growth will continue until 2021 where economic growth will be around one percent. "Swaziland economic growth next year will continue to be difficult as projections see the economy recording 0.9 percent economic growth," the IMF

Treasury finds Guptas' attack on Gordhan 'peculiar in the extreme'

APE TOWN - Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan did not make any "pronouncement or interpretation" on the Financial Intelligence Centre (FIC) report he included in his affidavit in a case centred on the Guptas, his office said yesterday.

Intervene

Last Friday, Gordhan asked the Pretoria High Court to rule he has no obligation to intervene in a decision by the country's top five banks to blacklist Gupta-controlled companies like Oakbay Investments.

Since then, the Guptas have led a media campaign to discredit Gordhan's application, calling into question the FIC report that shows they were cited for 72 alleged suspect transactions totalling R6.8bn.

On Wednesday, the Guptas announced they would oppose the application, saying "none of the transactions related to Oakbay or

the family, which are over a fiveyear period, were flagged to the FIC as suspicious".

Oakbay claimed the affidavit

"insinuated" the Guptas would "expose the fiscus not only to loss of tax revenue but also put the burden of mining rehabilitation on the fiscus". Yesterday, Treasury criticised the Guptas, their lawyers Van Der Merwe Associates and Oakbay Investments for waging a media campaign and welcomed their responding affidavit, which they were to table in court yester-

It said Treasury noted "the numerous attacks launched by the lawyers representing the Oakbay Group of companies on the affidavit filed by the Treasury in the Oakbay litigation as well as the contradictions contained therein".

"National Treasury wishes to also point out the affidavit by the minister has not made any pronouncement or interpretation on the FIC report and has sought solely to put the material facts before court," Treasury said.

"We welcome the announcement by Oakbay respondents that they intend to oppose the application after their unsuccessful attempt to coerce the minister into withdrawing the matter," Treasury said. "This will provide an opportunity for all issues to be properly ventilated in an open court."

"It is peculiar in the extreme for the aforementioned respondents to address the issues raised in the affidavit by way of media releases as these make no meaningful contribution to the case at hand," Treasury said. "The minister has presented his case under oath in an appropriate forum and it is incumbent upon the Oakbay respondents to do likewise should they wish to oppose his version." Fin24



PRISON ESCAPE, THE WORST MISTAKE EVER - OFFENDERS

hile His Majesty's Correctional
Services remains distraught by the
recent unfortunate act of escape by
seven inmates at Big Bend Correctional
Centre, offenders serving their sentences in
correctional facilities have sprung to condemn
such acts of cowardice by their colleagues
who face long term charges such as robbery,
rape, housebreaking and attempted murder
amongst others.

Unappreciative of the treatment programmes that are being offered by the department to offenders so they become rehabilitated beings and reintegrated to society, the seven are believed to have deviously broke out of their cell while awaiting trial and vanished into thin air. However, three of the culprits have been apprehended while officers are hot on the neels of the remaining four.

CONSEQUENCES

While the escapees await the consequences of their dim-witted decision, offenders within Correctional facilities have also raised their dissatisfaction over the issue, saying they have been immensely let down by the action of their colleagues.

The offenders who hold the same view with the commissioner general believe offenders should have the courage to face the consequences of their actions.

Not only undermining the institution's security, the escapees also proved to hold no regard for their colleagues who now have to grapple with the consequences of their escape. The Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase and all officers believe offenders who either await trial or have been convicted should be brave enough to face the consequences of their dire actions. Escaping from custody only accumulates the burden of offences which ultimately they would have to answer for.

Ntshangase however, thanked the media, security officers and members of the public for playing a mammoth task in apprehending three of the seven escape offenders in the likes of Mancoba Sibandze, Mpendulo Dlamini and Benson Shabalala.

The Commissioner General also mentioned officers would not rest until the remaining four: S'phamandla Dlamini, Wandile Sigwane, Sibusiso Masuku and Banele Dlamini (see right pictures in order) were brought to book. An interview with one of the offenders Thandaza Silolo who is currently serving his 15 year sentence at Matsapha Correctional Centre, revealed how inmates were disturbed by the escape of their fellow colleagues from Big Bend.

Silolo, who realised his mistake in life and handed himself over to the police after being on the run for three years said as the incarcerated society they sternly condemn the acts of escaping in prison and described it as being selfish and immature. He regrets having been on the run for such a lengthy period as that time could have been used serving his sentence.

Silolo believes being admitted into a correctional facility gives one the opportunity to reflect on the past mistakes and reform in order to become law abiding citizens. As such, he says courts remain with the mandate to decide the fate of those

society and handing them over to correctional institutions.

The 32-year-old offender explained escaping from custody with the intention to gain free-

MISTAKE

Silolo, who recently had his sentence reduced as a result of his good conduct while within the correctional premises further highlighted escaping from prison was the worst mistake any offender could think off.

Expanding on the repercussions of such a decision, he said inmates who escaped also prove to be insensitive on the part of those who remain behind as there are several privileges forfeited and unfavourable adjustments.

"It is true while serving a sentence in custody there is a certain relationship that develops between officers and inmates as they are tasked with the rehabilitation of offenders. These officers are the ones who help us with the rehabilitation programmes where at times we go out to partake in skills acquisition projects such as construction, industries and farming."

He said when such incidents unfold; there is completely lack of trust between the officers which affects the programmes aimed at helping inmates plus a majority of them are deprived of this privilege.

He said escaping from prison creates unnecessary enmity which could be avoided as officers are only tasked with safeguarding us and they cannot be held accountable for our wrong doing in society."

ADVICE

Silolo's stay in Matsapha also plays as testimony that escaping in prison has never been a sustainable life. While elaborating during the interview, he mentioned

a majority of offenders who once escaped from custody were recaptured and had to face the serious consequences of their actions. "Why would one escape only to be shot by police or more-so risk mob justice by the

community?"

He said the most important thing was for one to complete their sentence so by the time they regained independence, there was nothing to fear as one would be welcome by soci-

He further advised offenders not to risk their lives by escaping as such an act further infuriates the offended community. To this extent, Silolo highlighted everyone was a potential offender and those unfortunate to be found in conflict with the law should seek guidance from the laid down structures which are provided by the institution so they adapt to the new life in prison.






oday I have a special message for the Law Society of Swaziland as headed by Ben J. Simelane - stay out of politics!

I want to state upfront that the issues they are raising around the Supreme Court bench or lack of it are valid. However, the way they are going about it is political and is not going to serve them well.

I know something they can do which is consistent with their profession. You may ask what? They are schooled in law and they can use the same law to challenge the Judicial Service Commission (JSC) to account for the bench they are going to have come November.

At the moment, they are busy making noise, which to me is clear lobbying for something we don't even know for a fact whether the authorities are going to endorse

They started by threatening to boycott the forthcoming sitting of the Supreme Court if permanent judges of the Supreme Court are not going to be appointed.

They have gone further to lobby all their members to reject any appointment to serve on acting capacity in this court.

The question we are having is, if the Law Society of Swaziland is not doing some grandstanding and openly lobbying or forcing the authorities into some submission, why don't they do what they know best, ready an application to challenge the bench when once announced?

Doing so would be dealing with the legal issues, challenging the status of the bench based on law and seek its dissolution if it is not a permanent bench.


Any noise before we even know what type of bench we are having is politics and lawyers should stay out of it, because they are not politicians.

I am inclined to suspect that their current position is not genuine and is not motivated by law but by politics to force some arms of the Government into submission.

We don't want that. Lawyers argue better when they argue in terms of the law and have a mater before the court. As things stand we don't have the bench and we don't

know their prophetic side that the next bench will be made of acting judges.

At least for now, we know that we have three full-time judges who served with the previous two benches where lawyers were incorporated; that is the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala, Phesheya Senzangakhona Dlamini and Benjamin Odoki.

I am told that for purposes of hearing an appeal, these three judges do form a quorum and can sit in this court, whilst the issues affecting the Law Society of Swaziland are still being addressed.

Noise

If the situation, therefore, is not like it is so dire, why then are we making so much noise about a valid case.

The authorities of this country would want to be seen to be upholding the Constitution and if legitimate concerns are brought forward through proper procedures and follow laid down processes, who wouldn't listen to their concern.

We believe lawyers are none partisan and

therefore their agenda should not be driven by any ulterior motive but the law. So if they are persuaded by seeing the Constitution being upheld, then let's keep away from the gimmicks or threats and all and deal with the law, which will be at the time, we all know what we are dealing with.

Ay mobilisation before that makes us suspect that there s more to this issue than the law and the Constitution.

Position

The Law Society knows better that a hostile position in seeking to address their valid case will not help but harden the positions of those who have to make the appointments.

It was the same case in 2011 when they went on a four month strike that left all of them almost broke or out of business. I think no lawyer would like to go into the same experience.

That's why one is surprised at their threat to boycott everything.

So one is not going to go ahead of the processes still to be employed and start to

suggest options, but we would wait for the authorities to make the right call.

I must say however that we are aware about the not so good or hostile relationship that exists between the Judiciary and the Executive and let us hope that the lawyers are not playing into this game as well.

If the Executive and Judiciary are not seeing eye-to-eye on this matter, let them deal with it and not invite any one into their fights.

Concern

The concern and requirement to have a permanent bench is legitimate and it should not be used to force some party into submission using other means other than the courts if there are legitimate concerns.

It is in the interest of justice in this country that we have a proper Supreme Court bench and we stop the short fixes that are eroding our confidence in our courts. But my argument as stated above, we can reach an amicable conclusion without creating unnecessary anxiety, it benefits no one.

Dealing with Diabetes

What is glycaemia index?

The glycaemia index (GI) tells you how quickly food turns into sugar in your system.

Glycaemia load, a newer term, looks at both the glycaemia index and the amount of carbohydrate in food, giving you a more accurate idea of how food may affect your blood sugar level. High GI foods spike your blood sugar rapidly, while low GI foods have the least effect. According to American Diabetes Association, you can find glycaemia index and glycaemia load tables online, but you don't have to rely on food charts in order to make smart choices. Australian chef Michael Moore has come up with an easier way to regulate the carbohydrates you eat. He classifies foods into three broad categories: fire, water, and coal. The harder your body needs to work to break food down, the better.

Fire foods: have a high GI, and are low in fibre and protein. They include "white foods" (white rice, white pasta, white bread, potatoes, and most baked goods), sweets, chips, and many processed foods. They should be limited in your diet.

Water foods: are free foods—meaning you can eat as much as you like. They include all vegetables and most types of fruit (fruit juice, dried fruit, and canned fruit packed in syrup spike blood sugar quickly and are not considered water foods).

Coal foods: have a low GI and are high in fibre and protein. They include nuts and seeds, lean meats, seafood, whole grains, and beans. They also include "white food" replacements such as brown rice, whole-wheat bread, and whole-wheat pasta.

Eight principles of low-glycaemia eating

 Eat a lot of non-starchy vegetables. beans, and fruits: such as apples, pears, peaches, and berries. Even tropical fruits like bananas, mangoes, and papayas tend to have a lower glycaemia index than typical desserts.

 Eat grains in the least-processed state possible: "unbroken," such as whole-kernel bread, brown rice, and whole barley, millet, and wheat berries; or traditionally processed, such as stone-ground bread, steel-cut oats, and natural granola or muesli breakfast cereals.


 Limit white potatoes and refined grain products: such as white breads and white pasta to small side dishes.

, Limit concentrated sweets: including high-calorie foods with a low glycaemia such as ice cream—to occasional treats. Reduce fruit juice to no more than one cup a day. Completely eliminate sugar-sweetened drinks.

 Eat a healthful type of problem at most meals: such as beans, fish, or simlers chick-

Tricks for cutting down on sugar

 Reduce drinking soft drinks, soda and **juice:** A recent study found that for each 12 oz. serving of a sugar-sweetened beverage you drink a day, your risk for diabetes increases by about 15 percent. If you miss your carbonation kick, try sparkling water with a twist of lemon or lime or a splash of fruit juice. Reduce the amount of creamers and sweeteners you add to tea and coffee drinks.

• Sweeten foods yourself: Buy unsweetened iced tea, plain yogurt, or unflavoured oatmeal, for example, and add sweetener (or fruit) yourself. You're likely to add far less sugar than the manufacturer would have.

Reduce the amount of sugar in recipes: by 1/4 to 1/3. If a recipe calls for 1 cup of sugar, for example, use 3/3 or 3/4 cup instead. You can also boost sweetness with cinnamon, nutmeg, or vanilla extract.

Find healthy ways to satisfy your sweet tooth: Instead of ice cream, blend up frozen bananas for a creamy, frozen treat. Or enjoy a small chunk of dark chocolate, rather than your usual milk chocolate bar.

More on diet tips

Diabetes and your diet tip three: Choose fats wisely

Fats-can be either helpful or harmful in your diet. People with diabetes are at higher risk for heart disease, so it is even more important to be smart about fats. Some fats are unhealthy and others have enormous health benefits. But all fats are high in calories, so you should always watch your portion sizes.

Unhealthy fats: The two most damaging fats are saturated fats and Trans fats. Saturated fats are found mainly in animal products such as red meat and whole milk dairy products. Trans fats, also called partially hydrogenated oils, are created by adding hydrogen to liquid vegetable oils to make them more solid and less likely to spoil-which is very good for food manufacturers, and very bad for you.

Healthy fats: The best fats are unsaturated fats, which come from plant and fish sources and are liquid at room temperature. Primary sources include olive oil, canola oil, nuts, and avocados. Also focus on omega-3 fatty acids, which fight inflammation and support brain and heart health. Good sources include salmon, tuna, and flaxseeds.

Ways to reduce unhealthy fats and add healthy fats:

· Cook with olive oil instead of butter or veg-

• Trim any visible fat off meat before cooking and remove the skin before cooking chicken and turkey.

• Instead of chips or crackers, try snacking on nuts or seeds. Add them to your morning cereal or have a little handful for a filling snack. Nut butters are also very satisfying and full of healthy fats.

• Instead of frying, choose to grill, broil, bake, or stir-fry.

• Serve fish two or three times week instead

• Add avocado to your sandwiches instead of cheese. This will keep the creamy texture, but improve the health factor.

• When baking, use canola oil or applesauce instead of shortening or butter.

• Rather than using heavy cream, make your

soups creamy by adding low-fat milk thickened with flour, pureed potatoes, or reducedfat sour cream.

Diabetes and diet tip four: Eat regularly and keep a food diary

If you're overweight, you may be encouraged to note that you only have to lose 7% of your body weight to cut your risk of diabetes in half. And you don't have to obsessively count calories or starve yourself to do it. When it comes to successful weight loss, research shows that the two most helpful strategies involve following a regular eating schedule and recording what you eat.

Eat at regularly set times: Your body is better able to regulate blood sugar levels-and your weight-when you maintain a regular meal schedule. Aim for moderate and consistent portion sizes for each meal or snack.

Don't skip breakfast: Start your day off with a good breakfast. Eating breakfast every day will help you have energy as well as steady blood sugar levels.

Eat regular small meals—up to six per ay: People tend to eat larger portion they are overly hungry, so eating regularly will help you keep your portions in check.

Keep calorie intake the same: Regulating the amount of calories you eat on a day-to-day basis has an impact on the regularity of your blood sugar levels. Try to eat roughly the same amount of calories every day, rather than overeating one day or at one meal, and then skipping on the next.

SITEKI BIGGEST BRAAI COUNTDOWN BEGINS

he countdown has already begun. Next Saturday would see the second leg of the Biggest Braai being staged; this time in Siteki, Lubombo region.

The good news is that more live bands have been included to spice up the event with some flair and fluidity.

The entertainment line-up now has veterans in the game in the mould of gospel music artist Sipho 'Big Fish' Makhabane who would be bringing a full live band to the event and Mshikishi Mndzebele to provide mbhaqanga music.

Others would be several DJs yet to be disclosed and upcoming gospel sensation, the ever shining Nonhle Mthethwa.

The Siteki Biggest Braai is hosted by Philani MaSwati Charity Organisation, Siteki Nazarene High School Alumni and the Siteki Town Council. Its aim is to raise funds for all three organisations in their various charitable activities to be undertaken.

Philani MaSwati has Her Majesty the Indlovukazi as its patron and was founded solely to assist the elderly destitute citizens live a productive life despite being ripe in age. However, in recent years, orphaned and vulnerable children (OVC) have been included as beneficiaries after it emerged most households were now child headed owing to the devastating and telling impact of HIV and AIDS.

Admission is E300 and gets an individual a braai pack as well as a stand, E450 for two braai packs and stand whilst E650 secures you four braai packs and stand. Swaziland Meat Industries has joined the three partners in their fundraising efforts by sponsoring with the braai packs.

Starting time would be 9am till late at the Siteki bus rank.

To demonstrate his benevolent act, Makhabane would be constructing a two roomed house as part of the activity of charity work with the beneficiary yet to be identified by Philani MaSwati organisation. However, the destitute or needy person must be from the Lubombo region, Siteki area as confirmed by Philani MaSwati Chairman Lutfo Dlamini.

Also those born in the month of October would share a huge birthday cake with their names engraved on it. It's a unique arrangement by the organisers to spice up things a bit.

The Siteki Biggest Braai follows closely on the footsteps of July 22 one staged at IDM Campus in Matsapha. The latter has become a household event an annual gathering where several companies are now known supporters and sponsors.

The Siteki instalment also has sponsors such as Swaziland Broadcasting and Information Services, SMI, etc.

A brief history of the entertainers; Mshikishi Mndzebele is a veteran mbhaqanga music artist who now belongs to the country's senior citizens. After all he turned 61 years on July 27 and aptly called



'Gorilla Man' as a result of his peculiar dancing skills. He recently released a 10-track album **Overtime** that was recorded in Mtubatuba, SA.

This latest album contains the track *maSwati* ('monarchical democracy'), which promotes the tinkhundla system of governance as a flagship for the country and urges. the nation to embrace it.

This track is trending not only in the country but in neighbouring South Africa and beyond as some are grappling to grasp the finer aspects of the system hence is both relevant and revered. He has been in the industry for the past 42 years, having kicked-off his career through dancing in bars in 1974, even though he did not indulge in alcohol. He was to be later discovered by a South African band called 'Emagugu Esimanjemanje', which was popular at the time, who introduced him to stage performing.

Rocking

The band toured Zimbabwe, where a young Oliver Mtukudzi watched him perform.

After the tour, Mshikishi returned home in 1976 to share the art with his people and has been rocking the masses since then.

Despite being in the industry for over four decades, he's only released seven albums to date and could give the young a run for their money with his peculiar but perfect dancing skills. Other albums are; the debut

'Wayengekho Ubaba', 'eBhunya' (baholilie), 'Interstate', 'Selimathunzi', 'Solomon' and 'Maye Muhle'.

Honoured


He a few years back collaborated with the Prodigal Sonz in their album titled 'Singumliba' for the track *Yiba nami baba*. Mshikishi was honoured with the Inyatsi Construction Traditional Artist of the Year award in 2013 during the National Arts and Culture Council Awards at Kwaluseni, UNISWA Sports Emporium.

Prior to that (in 2010) he had been decorated with an honorary award by the Matiwane Manana Arts Foundation for his contribution to the arts industry in Swaziland.

He also served as President of the Swaziland Arts and Music Association (SWAMA).

'Big Fish' Makhabane, meanwhile, is another old horse in the music industry. Having debuted with 'Thum' Umlilo' in 1993, he has never looked back ever since.





Born in Mhlangatane, Northern Hhohho, Makhabane doesn't have a glorious past.

But he's defied all odds after dropping out in Grave Five (Standard Three) and became a household name in the gospel music scene both locally, regionally and beyond.

He's just returned from performing in Birmingham, UK where he left many at awe with his renditions despite being over 50. The 'Big Fish' has also performed in the USA and numerous countries in the SADC region. He is also good at nurturing talent and is presently promoting his mass choir group, Mpumalanga Praise, where he put together fine voices he assisted blend during auditions conducted in the month of June.

This group last month on Makhabane's birthday launched their debut live DVD and CD which was graced by a number of prominent gospel musicians.

Locally he's assisted the likes of Frans Dlamini, Shongwe and Khuphuka Saved group, Ncandweni Christ Ambassadors, Shiba and Travellers, etc. ascend the ladder of success.

In 2010 Pastor Timothy Myeni even gave him a cow in appreciating his efforts of assisting Ncandweni journey to great-

Makhabane relocated to Mpumalanga after dropping out of school and briefly worked for Telkom SA (six months) prior to trying his hand in gospel music and has never looked back ever since.

Kicking his career as Brother Sipho Makhabane in the early 90s, he was to later collaborate with Amanxusa KaKrestu who backed him and they released a number of albums.



Delisile's brand new white
2013 BMW 1 series stops at an intersection in the bustling streets of downtown Johannesburg.

Her friend, a post-graduate student at a university in the city of gold, gets out of the vehicle and walks across the street. Within seconds, a silver pistol bangs loudly on the window of her priced German machine. "Get out of the car!" a male voice commands, she recalls. "Get out now!" Panicking and scared, she looks slowly in the direction of the voice, hands up in the air. "I said get out!" the man impatiently roars. All she remembers was seeing a shiny pistol pointed at her. She has lost memory of everything that happened after she was forced out of her car on that fateful afternoon in the notorious downtown Johannesburg, where she and her friend had gone on a shopping spree at the famous Oriental Plaza."

"I had just dropped off my friend who had walked across the street to load airtime. As I was waiting for her to return, a man hit my window so hard and ordered me out of the vehicle. This was literally within seconds of my friend disappearing into the shop across. At first, I thought someone was playing a silly trick on me, but it was real. As I opened the door, he threatened to shoot me if I did anything stupid. That's the only memory I have of the fateful event. My car was never recovered. I'm just happy I lived to tell the story. It could have been worse; I've read and heard about stories of people who get shoved inside the boot and dumped somewhere, or even raped and killed. Two years later, my mind still replays that scene. To this day, I don't drive to Johannesburg," she says.

Deli is one of many Swazi women who fall victim to cunning thugs who use complex tricks to steal or hijack their cars, particularly while driving in the cities of South Africa and Mozambique. Of all these, hijackings are the worst, according to those who have fallen victim. There are suggestions that women are often viewed by criminals as soft targets, because of the assumption they are often less likely to resist or because they are often not concentrating on their surroundings. Either that or other reasons, women, like all other motorists, are always encouraged to be alert. Other crimes include what is commonly known as smash and grab, where the criminal uses an object to break a window before making away with valuables inside the vehicle - from mobile phones, to laptops, iPads and bags. Smash and grabs usually happen in busy intersections in cities and metros such as Johannesburg, Pretoria, Cape Town and Durban. Usually, motorists fall victim when traffic moves slowly, presumably because thugs know the driver is concentrating on the traffic flow. Officials in South Africa say criminals often work in two with one distracting the driver, while the other pounces. While violent crime is one's worst nightmare, criminals also use other sophisticated tricks to steal cars. Like in the case of Gcebile, who almost lost her new Mercedes Benz A-Class to a thug who posed as an agent of the dealership where she bought her car. "I had just







Contributing towards access to food for primary schools in Swaziland

1.0 Introduction

The establishment of school gardens and small irrigation projects is funded by Esicojeni Foundation and implemented by Save the Children as an initiative aimed at enhancing access to nutritious food. This particular initiative aims at improving the nutritional status of children through production of fresh vegetables and other field crops. The support provided to schools to produce their own food complement their school feeding program is in line with Esicojeni mission of Ending Hunger particularly amongst children.

Esicojeni Foundation interventions target the most vulnerable and hard to reach children. For this phase of the project, two schools were selected from the two poorest regions, namely Lubombo and Shiselweni and which are also highly affected by the current drought caused by El nino. The primary schools are Patmos and St Philips from Shiselweni and Lubombo respectively.

1.1 Objectives

To diversify the diet of 796 learners through enhancing food production in both Patmos and St Phillips primary schools.

To assist Patmos and St Phillips primary schools to reduce the cost of running the school feeding program.

2.0 Process

Meaningful participation of the targeted schools was considered throughout the implementation phases, i.e., from inception, planning, execution and project handover. Clear terms of reference were developed and agreed upon by Save the Children and the targeted schools stipulating respective roles of school committees, parents, students and teachers on the nature during the implementation of the food production project. As part of enhancing sustainability of the food production projects in both schools, parents of learners were mobilized to contribute with the following inputs; time, money and labour.

3.0 Implementation

The school gardening project was implemented in four stages, namely; (i) fencing, (ii) installation of the small irrigation system, (iii) mounting of two five thousand liters of water tanks on different elevated platforms (fabricated steel stand and surface concrete slab), (iv) installation of drag line irrigation system. The schools were responsible for meeting cost of land preparation and providing labour for planting of seedlings.

Patmos primary irrigation system connected to the existing gravity fed system which draws water from a reliable stream. In both sites, irrigations taps were installed with an extended 30m hose pipes. The system is supported by elevated water tanks to facilitate irrigation of the 1 hector fenced production area.
- c) Production: both schools successfully transplanted a range of vegetable crops including; cabbages, spinaches, green pepper, tomatoes, Lettice and carrots.



bought the car when I received a call on my mobile phone from a guy who introduced himself as Justice, claiming to represent the dealership where I bought my car.

Homework

That man had done his homework because he had all my details, including my mobile number and ID details. He 'sold' me some story which ended with the line they were calling to arrange to fetch my car.

Coincidentally, I was on another line with Mercedes Benz Sandton when he called. I immediately alerted the person I was talking to and he told me the dealership would never do such. But how do women live with the scars from these horrifying experiences?

Experiences

Where does one even begin to look for help, especially if it happens while one is far away in Johannesburg, Pretoria or Durban? These are some of the difficult experiences victims of such dangerous crimes deal with. What about the emotional aftermaths? Who helps victims heal from the trauma? "Counselling helped me a lot," says a Swazi woman who also lost her new Volvo hatchback to hijacking in SA about four years ago. "I think I have healed as best as I ever will.

I'm still scared though and am always suspicious of cars following me. I resisted going the counselling route until I realised I wasn't coping," she adds. There is a rising number of women who own cars these days, and with modern lifestyles demanding that we spend more and more time on the road, for both business and pleasure, discussions about cars are no longer just the exclusive privilege of men. This also means that just as men empower and excite themselves with motoring conversations, women too need to inform themselves more about the challenges that come with owning and driving cars. Hijackings and the opportunistic smash and grab attacks are not the only challenges facing women on the road. Imagine waking up one day rushing to a meeting and boom! your car tyre is flat. Where do you even begin? Call your partner, male colleague or that cocky neighbour of yours who drives you nuts?

Sophisticated

Do you even know where the spare wheel is? Modern cars are packed with all sorts of sophisticated technology, which, literally communicates with you every other minute. 
his world has two people; those that brighten your day by their mere existence, then there are those that want you to laugh with, when it suits them.

Gordhan was conspicuous by his absence from this year's BRICS summit in Goa, India, this week. He was too busy at home fighting for his political survival – and that of his country.

President Jacob Zuma, leaving the dirty work in his increasingly messy fray with Gordhan to his minions back home, was happily abroad jiving with Kenyan President Uhuru Kenyatta and attending a whole range of meetings, including of course the Goa summit, with several other cabinet ministers and business leaders.

A pity because Gordhan's views on the Goa summit would have been interesting to hear.

At the BRICS summit that South Africa hosted in Durban in 2013, the five member countries agreed to establish their own Internet, separate from the one that you and I and the rest of the world are using. The leaders seemed to have been provoked into doing this by revelations that US intelligence had been cyber-spying on foreign leaders, including then Brazilian president Dilma Rousseff.

Gordhan was asked by a journalist after the summit if it was not absurd for BRICS to try to create its own discrete Internet, since universality seems to be essential to the whole concept. He snapped back that the journalist needed to get up to speed with political reality.

BRICS has not yet established its own Internet, as far as one can tell. Given the Chinese government's total occupation of its own cyberspace, the concept of a BRICS Internet has slightly sinister connotations.

So what would Gordhan have thought of another seemingly Parallel Universe (or, some would say, balanced) project agreed on at the Goa summit – for BRICS to establish its own credit rating agency?

Clayson Monyela, spokesperson for the South African Department of International Relations and Cooperation, triumphantly tweeted the news from Goa. And it was hard not to detect the reaction of members of the Zuma camp, a middle finger being shown to the big three private, US-based rating agencies, Standard and Poor's, Moody's and Fitch, which are playing such a pivotal role in the Zuma-Gordhan struggle for South Africa's fiscus.

Sentiment

Responding to Monyela, one random tweeter articulated that sentiment best with this remark: "It is tough 2 move frm Western bullies but we hv 2. They hv agents in the country & worse in cabinet. Let's soldier on #BRICS." Opposition Democratic Alliance finance spokesman David Maynier was however skeptical, retweeting Monyela with the comment: "You mean a BRICS counter-Ratings Agency?" Many others on Twitter shared Maynier's sentiment.

University of KwaZulu Natal's Patrick Bond noted in an article in *The Conversation* that South Africa's energy parastatal Eskom was in the process of negotiating a US\$5 billion loan from China so South Africa could argue the case for self-financing a nuclear programme, likely to be acquired from Russia or China.

"In this context, a new BRICS credit rating agency with loose standards may just be another excuse to put future generations of South Africans deeper into debt, while facilitating corrupt dealings."

DOES BRICS' INHABIT A PARALLEL UNIVERSEP

Could BRICS' decision to establish a credit rating agency be just about balancing an unbalanced global economy?



Nonetheless many commentators see the need for an alternative credit rating agency to the big three agencies which failed so badly to do their job during the 2008 global financial meltdown.

Refusing

And the BRICS agency also has a credible immediate cause. Kundapur Kamath, President of the New Development Bank (NDB) – or BRICS Bank – said at the summit that a BRICS credit rating agency was necessary because the big three private agencies were refusing to give the NDB the top AAA rating as the BRICS countries sponsoring it were not themselves AAA-rated.

That was increasing the price of the loans it was trying to raise and was therefore constraining the growth of developing countries, Kamath told the BRICS Financial Forum in Goa. Kamath said the conservative lending policies demanded of multilateral banks like the NDB were also stifling the growth of developing countries.

He questioned why a bank like NDB had to limit its leverage to just three times its capital reserves, despite lending to

sovereigns, whereas a commercial bank could lend up to nine times its reserves, despite taking higher risks. Kamath said it was time for developing countries to sit down and talk to the rating agencies because if they changed their approach a whole lot more money could be released for development.

Earlier, Yaduvendra Mathur, Chairman of India's Exim Bank, also backed the BRICS credit rating agency, saying it would bring

down his borrowing costs. He told India's PTI news agency that while Exim Bank had an AAA rating domestically, it couldn't get one internationally.

He also suggested the big three rating agencies, which controlled 90% of the market, had a basic conflict of interest, because they made issuers pay for ratings rather than investors.

Conflict

It was precisely that inherent conflict of interest that was exposed during the 2008 global financial crisis when the big three continued to give the highest ratings to major institutions to issue investments which were just fancy packaging for loads of worthless 'sub-prime' mortgages.

Nevertheless, if Standard and Poor's, Moody's and Fitch have conflicts of interest, would a BRICS credit rating agency that had to rate a BRICS bank not raise the same doubts? Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi insisted the agency would be set up independently of the four governments. But it might be hard nonetheless to convince investors and lenders it would be objective and credible.

Prof Daniel Bradlow, SARCHI Professor of International Development Law and African Economic Relations at the University of Pretoria, agrees that the objectivity and independence of both the big three agencies and the proposed BRICS credit rating agency are questionable.

"However the creation of a new agency will create competition and offer investors, issuers and other stakeholders more choice and more diversity in views on creditworthiness. In this sense the BRICS CRA is to be welcomed."

How would Gordhan like a BRICS credit rating agency? Back in 2013, during his first term as finance minister, he might well have. But today? The embattled minister with a death grip on the keys to the Treasury has in effect recruited the big three in his battle with Zuma and his cronies to prevent the looting of state coffers.

Junk

He is using the threat of a downgrade by the big three of South Africa's rating to junk status, to try to prevent the looting. The big three, for all their other faults, are serving Gordhan – and the country – well.

Luckily the BRICS credit rating agency, if it comes, will probably be too late to help Zuma. Perhaps that conversation between the developing countries and the big three that Kamath proposes is a better idea than a BRICS agency. And, who knows, maybe the proposal to establish one was a ploy to persuade the big three to negotiate.

If a way could be found in such discussions to persuade the credit rating agencies to sympathise more with the developing world perspective and, in this case, to release more NDB funding, for instance – without taking undue risks – that would probably help Africa too. The African Regional Centre of the NDB is about to open in Johannesburg. Africa is likely to be at the back of the queue for NDB funds – after the five BRICS members themselves. So it needs the taps to be opened wider.

basic description of culture is given by Helen Spencer-Oatey, one of the few researchers who has interest in understanding the term culture and how it can be applied to the general spheres of life and in business in particular.

Sne argues that this term can mean the employment of special intellectual or artistic endeavours or products.

However, academicians like Matsumoto (1996:16) contend that culture comprised of a collection of set of attitudes, values, beliefs, and behaviours shared by a group of people, but different for each individual, communicated from one generation to the next. Perhaps we can go by this understanding since we are discussing about business

Making your business a cultured **Business**

There are however several considerations that need to be taken into account when it comes to developing a strong cultured business. Jerome Bloom, the author of a book Fueled by Failure, he states that one of the reasons culture was important in an organisation was to understand which was the best steps to make in the event of business failure. He argues that successful organisations worked in such well coordinated ways of doing things which they called their culture.

Share the dream

It is then important that a prudent business person will aim at building a strong culture within his or her team, making it a culture which then becomes the core purpose of business success. It is important to note that you will want a culture that recognises and embraces shared values, attitudes, standards, and beliefs that characterise the goals of the organisation.

Now here is where most people lose it. They start their businesses quite well with a strong will power and vision, but as the business is growing, they become somehow selfish and want to hold things to themselves instead of expanding the values and beliefs of that given organisation.

Charity and consistency

It is a good practice for one to be very clear and maintain high levels of consistence in the way things were done. Establishing a culture you believe in means having a clear and consistent vision and knowing how you'd like everyone, inside and outside, to view the company. Many old-school CEOs and leaders were often business operations first and people second. But it's the people that make a business successful. This means that a good business owner or manager will consider working with the people first who will in turn make up the business. the idea of just using people without addressing their respective eeds works out badly for most businesses cause a manager must establish a situation in which the people feel to own the entire business rather than being used. This

then becomes a culture of exchange in which the employer and his or her employees do things on the basis of exchange.

Transparency

Another critical area that needs to be addressed is the issue of transparency. A good manager must not raise suspension among his or her workers; everyone in an organisation must see things in much similar ways. It is a good practice to make your workers to bear with you with regards to the operations of the business, at times things do not go the way you planned and you seem to have been faced with situations would either slow you or have a challenge at all, but if you worked alone without the knowledge of the masses, you are likely to be faced with stroke because employees will just think you are making up things. Learn to have a collective approach to doing things at work by going over all the key metrics of the business with the entire company. The goal is for all employees to feel they know the thinking, responsibilities, and strategy at various levels of the company and can share ideas and feedback no matter who they are.

Another thing we do to help bring more

transparency into the organisation is what we call a TGIF (I got this idea from Google). Our TGIF calls take place every other Friday and are all-hands calls. Everyone in the company can participate and ask questions. Since people often feel intimidated or uncomfortable in any-question-welcome situation, we built a private forum on the Integrate server where employees can ask anonymous questions.

Empowerment and a sense of freedom

Most people think giving directives and general guidelines was the way to employee empowerment. You empower people by not micromanaging, erring on the side of giving people general guidelines rather than explicit, detailed directions. Informed employees are more involved and empowered in a company. And the more freedom people have to take on tasks, manage them, find solutions, and execute them, the more they feel connected to and woven into the company's culture.

Your organisational design

Jerome Bloom, also argues that organisational design was vital in the areas of establishing a strong organisational culture he states that organisational design is the processes, structure, and hierarchy you put into place that allow you to put your culture into practice. It's how you do things. This will include your communication, company policies, team building, performance indicators, performance evaluations, division of responsibilities, and even how you schedule, and run, meetings. For example, do you have a weekly meeting at the same time and in the same place, or do you hold meetings only when there's something worthy of discussing at a meeting? Are meetings for all employees, division heads, or certain team members? Do you always meet in conference rooms, in a specific area of the office, or by conference calls, or does the setting

If designed well, everyone in the business can do his or her job more effectively. Your business culture will significantly be enhanced if the organisational design you put into place clarifies authority, responsibility, and accountability.



or millions of pets and people, the tiny flea is a remorseless enemy that can be life-threatening. The flea is a small, brown, wingless insect that uses specialised mouthparts to pierce the skin and siphon blood.


An adult flea lays 20-30 eggs a day (500 in a lifetime). At this rate one flea in your home can become a full flea infestation. If one dog or cat in the household has fleas, assume that all pets in the household have fleas. A single flea found on your pet means that there are probably hundreds of fleas, larva, pupa and eggs in your house. Eggs can survive in the house or yard for weeks to months and cause re-infection.

Fleas are not only itchy blood-suckers, they can transmit diseases:

Flea allergy dermatitis - when a flea bites, it injects a small amount of saliva into the skin to prevent blood coagulation. Some animals become allergic to this saliva resulting in severe itching and scratching. This can cause hair loss, redness, scaling and bacterial infection.

Tapeworm - though not transmitted by bites, tapeworm is transmitted when the dog/cat grooms and ingests a flea carrying the tapeworm larva. The larva develops in

Flea life cycle

Most of a flea's life cycle is spent in the house or garden and not on the pet, which is why your dog/cat may continue to scratch

without you ever seeing a flea on him.

• Eggs. The adult flea uses your dog/cat as a place to take its blood meals and breed. Fleas either lay eggs directly on the animal where they may drop off, or deposit eggs into the immediate surroundings (your home or yard). The eggs hatch into larvae that live in carpeting, cracks or corners of the dog/cat's living area.

• Larvae. The larvae survive by ingesting dried blood, animal dander and other organia matter.

 Pupa and adult. Larvae develop into pupa that hatch into adults. Adults are capable of leaping several feet to hop onto a passing dog/cat.

Prevention

Preventative medication is the only way to avoid fleas. By treating your dog/cat correctly, you may save yourself the expense of having to call in pest control specialists to treat your entire house and yard. The most important domestic development in controlling fleas is the vacuum cleaner. If possible, vacuum your house regularly.

• The best flea products are obtainable only with a prescription.

 Available products include flea collars, shampoos, sprays, powders, dips, spot-on and oral applications.

• The most effective is a monthly spot-on or oral application.

Consult your veterinarian.

Follow instructions meticulously.

• Do not use a dog treatment on a cat or the cat may die.

• Observe the age restrictions for puppies and kittens on all product labels.

• Wash all pet bedding weekly.

of hot weather and the effects of draught which has caused water to be rationed in some parts of the country for a number of days, so as to avoid dehydration, Swazis are more likely than ever to resort to drinking bottled water sold in supermarkets and food outlets to quench their thirst.

Water makes up about 60 percent of our body weight. We need to get enough water every day from the fluids and foods in our diet to keep our bodies functioning at their best.

We get about 20 percent of the water our bodies need from the foods we eat and the remainder comes from beverages, including drinking water. With our busy lifestyles and weather patterns which are not conducive, it is no surprise that bottled water has become a popular way to meet these needs.

Consumers drink bottled water for various reasons including taste preference, convenience, safety and potential health benefits. But is there anything that guides us as consumers on the quality of the bottled water?

What about the claims made on the labels of the bottled water containers? Bottled water is drinking water (e.g., well water, distilled water, or spring water) packaged in plastic or glass water bottles.

It may be carbonated or not. Bottled water may be contaminated by a range of chemicals

(e.g. lead), microbial (bacteria, viruses and parasites) and physical hazards (e.g. glass chips) that could pose risks to health if they are present at high levels.

Because of the large number of possible hazards in bottled water, SWASA has developed two standards as a way of ensuring that bottled water delivered to consumers is safe. The two bottled water standards are SZNS 033:2014 – Bottled drinking water other than natural water Mineral- Specification and SZNSSANS 1657:2009 – Bottled Water of Subterranean origin.

Consumption

Both standards specify physical, chemical and microbiological requirements for bottled water for human consumption and they also specify the permitted treatments, testing and the requirements for packaging, bottling and labelling.

Knowing that water can support the growth of many types of microorganisms and the presence of disease causing microbes in water is known to be unhealthy and even life threatening, Table 1 (microbiological determinants requirements) of both standards gives zero tolerance to the presence of microorganisms that can relate to waterborne diseases.

Specify

The two standards also specify the limits for the physical and chemical determinants of the bottled water together with the frequency of testing and the sampling programme which indicates the sample sizes for the physical examination and microbiological examination and the sample volume for chemical analysis.

According to the general requirements of the two standards, no claims concerning medicinal (preventative, alleviative or curative) or other beneficial effects relating to the health of the consumer shall be made and the use of any statement or of any pictorial device which might create confusion in the mind of the public or in any way mislead the public about the nature, origin, composition and properties of the bottled water put on sale is prohibited.

The label shall state whether it is carbonated (sparkling) or non-carbonated (still).

The standards also state that the location of the source of the water being bottled, the name of the source and the name, telephone and physical address of the manufacturer should be declared.

As consumers enjoy their bottled water, the only assurance they have of a healthy wholesome product is if manufacturers adhere to all the requirements stipulated in the bottled water standards.

Local Companies who are in the bottled water industry are advised to consult these two National Standards to make sure they adhere to the laid down processes and procedures which can lead to certification of their products.


Product certification is the process of certifying that a product has passed performance tests and quality assurance tests in order to meet the necessary local, national or international quality standards relevant to a particular market or product set.

Product certification is often required in sensitive industry and marketplace areas where a failure could have serious consequences, such as negatively affecting the health and welfare of the people or person using that product.

SWASA has a Product Certification Scheme with a recognizable logo. Once certified, a company will be able to display the SWASA's certification mark on the product produced, offering objective verification of its conformity to requirements.

The SWASA Certification is designed to help manufacturers build trust in client – buyer relationships.

oday we will look at what has always been the issue from various ministries and campaigns about vegetables.

Vegetables were originally collected from the wild but have now moved to be part of our domestic source of food and they are cultivated in protected environments. We have a wide range of vegetables and naming them all can be a waste of time and ink so for that reason we will focus on a few locally available ones.

As the Home Economics Section under the Ministry of Agriculture we find it of uttermost importance to school the public on the general know how of vegetables and how they can be utilised.

Importance of eating vegetables

Most vegetables are nutritious and delicious, either eaten raw or cooked. Eating more of vegetables provides health benefits and people who eat more vegetables are healthier than those people who don't like them.

This is because most vegetables, as a lot of other food stuff is considered as medicinal that is if eaten in the right quantity as well. To make an example of commonly grown and famous vegetable items like tomatoes and onions.

Tomatoes help purifies the blood, increases urine output, increases infection fighting capabilities and prevents oxidation of cholesterol.

Onions improve blood circulation and thus prevents blood clotting. With so many cases of high blood pressure one must try to include onions in daily servings either as a part of salads or any relish ranging from *ligusha*, *imibhidvo to* meat to avoid the hospitals. Onions also help in kidney problems, stimulate the detoxifying function of the liver and prevent stomach and colon cancer.

Now most people, particularly the youth and young adults think these are old people diseases and they should be warned. Our health is like an investment, what we put in now is the determinant of whether our future will be mostly calendared with doctor appointments or *sibebe* rock climbing dates.

Vegetables basically provide most nutrients vital for health and maintenance of our body. Most of us definitely have heard about the phrase that food is medicinal.

For instance **Lettuce** help reduces stress, treat insomnia (sleeplessness), treat constipation, and treat obesity, treat digestive disorders, and it's tolerated by diabetics.


Pepper help stimulates the flow of gastric juices, prevents digestive cancer, it is a mild laxative, protects the circulatory system, it is tolerated by diabetics and suitable for the diet of the obese.

They (Vegetables) are naturally low in fat and calories, when utilised as sauces or seasonings may add fat or calories.

working in collaboration with the Ministry of Agriculture (H.E. Section) is currently involved in nutrition campaigns that encourage the nation to consume more of nutrients either plant or animal sourced. Vegetables are also sources of many nutrients including potassium, dietary fiber, vitamin C and vitamin A. Vegetables are rich in vitamins and minerals that help you feel healthy and energised

Potassium can be provided by sweet potatoes, white potatoes, tomato products (paste and juices), spinach, and kidney/soybeans. These are mostly drought tolerant crops and can even be grown in the dry regions like Shiselweni or Lubombo.

Dietary fibre from vegetables is important for proper bowel function; helps reduce constipation as well as provide a feeling of fullness which will reduce the number of servings per day. This dietary fibre can be sourced include cabbage, lettuce, carrots and spinach. To get more of this fibre it's recommended to eat these vegetables raw as salads or smoothies.

Vitamin A keeps eyes and skin healthy and helps to protect against infections. Vegetable sources of Vitamin A include most green leafy vegetables as well as tomatoes.

Vitamin C helps heal cuts and wounds as well as keep gums and teeth healthy. Vitamin C also aids in iron absorption examples of foods high in Vitamin C include cabbages, spinach, green/red pepper and asparagus.

Food and nutrition gardens

This is not much different from the mostly used term of backyard gardens. This is basically means of promoting small scale subsistence agriculture It's usually not too big ranging from 500 square fit to 800 sq.ft.

This is a manageable size and doesn't need gallons of water to irrigate it.

Its main purpose in our department is for the constant convenient supply of vegetables in a household to ensure food and nutrition security. Farmers can rotate the vegetables grown each time but mainly focusing on the mostly used household vegetables like spinach, carrots, onions, tomatoes, beetroots, cabbages or green pepper.

Water Harvesting/recycling

Talking about vegetable growth or any form of cropping these days is never welcomed well in our country. This is because one is always bombarded with the obvious excuse of water scarcity due to the prevailing drought in our country and continent. Water recycling is one method which has helped communities grow vegetables despite moisture challenges. If truth be told, no matter how terrible the drought can be, we always find water to bath, clean houses and wash dishes. This water can be reused to water backyard gardens at home which in turn help boost the nutritional status of families' members. Simple steps of treating the water is putting sand or ash for at least 24 hours so to trap down the dirt. To avoid wastage of the little water, we usually recommend using this system in combination with a drip kit.

This drip kit can either be a small tank or drum with pipes. Another simple method is using 2l containers with small holes in the lids to release water or drip few drops at a time. This way we can assure food and nutrition security, one homestead at a time.

Basic tips on how to prepare vegetables in order to preserve nutrients

As the Home Economics Section we

emphasise that everything we eat should be for nutritional benefit and not only to fill up the stomach. Most times nutrients never get to benefit the consumers because we don't understand the critical rules of vegetables. Now most people like to cook their vegetables before eating whereas this is one of the detrimental steps in food preparation. Cooking and reheating vegetables can diminish their nutritional value because some vitamins are degraded by heat. Basically the way you cook your food has a major effect on the amount of nutrients you eventually get.

Yes cooking improves the digestion and increases absorption of many nutrients but several nutrients get lost in the process. So the tip to retain maximum nutrition in vegetables is to minimize cooking time. Vitamin c is mostly lost during boiling. We should try to cut down the time for preparing our spinach, cabbages and other Vitamin C giving vegetables and try eating it raw at least. Cook close to service time.

Heat isn't the only problem as some nutrients end up leaching out into the cooking, liquid so consume the liquid left in pan or pot after cooking vegetables.

Use as little water as possible for boiling vegetables to reduce loss of vitamin C and B vitamins.

Don't peel vegetables until after cooking them. Better yet, don't peel at all to maximize fiber and nutrient density.

Try to finish cooked vegetables within a day or two as vitamin C content may continue to decline when cooked food is exposed to air.

Don't cut/chop vegetables and then wash them as the water soluble nutrients are drained out of the leaves.

Steam where appropriate instead of boiling Use just enough water to cover.

I would call the men that still think the way I use to start to research and rethink their opinions on male circumcision and they will become the man that I am.

orruption is the most neglected human rights violation of our time. It fuels injustice, inequality and depravation, and is a major catalyst for migration and terrorism.

In Africa, the social and political consequences of corruption rob nations of resources and potential, and drive inequality, resentment and radicalisation. Corruption cheats the continent's governments of some US\$50bn annually, and stymies successful cities, sustainable economies and safe societies.

A joint report by the African Development Bank and Global Financial Integrity found that up to 65 percent of this lost revenue disappeared in commercial transactions by multinational companies.

According to Oxfam, as much as 30 percent of African financial wealth is estimated to be held offshore, costing an estimated US\$14bn in lost tax revenues

every year.

This corruption discourages donors and destroys investor confidence, strangling development, progress and prosperity.


Added to that, across the continent, sociopolitical dissatisfaction at corruption provides fertile ground for radicalisation, and some extremist organisations are adept at portraying Islamism as the solution to such injustice.

For example, corruption stimulates recruitment of young Nigerians into the ranks of Boko Haram. In a recent study, 70 percent of those interviewed in the state of Sokoto cited corruption as a factor driving radicalisation.

By understanding corruption's full impact d seeing it through the eyes of its victims, can create new weapons to combat it. This worth considering as we approach the firstur review of the Sustainable Development

More can be done at a global level to support these ambitions. Bilateral trade agreements should be based on commitments to end corruption and protect human rights, and protocols to prevent corruption should be built into development aid and loans.

There are some encouraging signs on the continent. When leaders from countries such as Kenya, Rwanda, Nigeria and Tanzania

highlight corruption as a major threat to their countries, then we might just be seeing the final days of impunity. The test now is whether they deliver on these fresh anti-corruption promises incredible ways that take account of human rights.

Enforced

Human rights are enforced by international treaties, backed by judicial bodies with teeth such as the International Criminal Court, the International Court of Justice and regional bodies such as the African Court on Human and People's Rights.

The United Nations Security Council and the African Union's Peace and Security

Council can impose sanctions in response to violations of political, economic, social or cultural rights, or to deal with torture, genocide and war crimes. On top of that, countries and international bodies have an obligation to act when human rights are breached.

Yet there is no such obligation to act against endemic corruption. International agreements define various corrupt practices as a crime, but not corruption itself. Instead, it is passively defined as a technical flaw in governance, its horrors disguised in legalese. Corruption's victims get little mention.

That's why so little progress has been made by the UN Convention Against Corruption (UNCAC). This global agreement elevated anti-corruption action to the world stage. But UNCAC relies on states for implementation, and - unlike global protocols governing human rights - there is no effective sanction for those in breach. An absence of enforcement creates space for corrupt officials and businesspeople to hide without fear of pursuit or prosecution. And there is little political will to change things.

We need to give UNCAC muscle by joining the moral and legal dots between corruption, human rights abuses and international crimes. Acknowledging the negative human rights impact of corruption makes it imperative for African states to provide better protection to their citizens. Africans have the most at stake in getting anti-corruption efforts to work, because corruption disproportionately affects poor people. A more rights-based approach to corruption is a good strategy for both African and European governments. It would mean greater political stability, and provide an environment for sustained social and economic development. This, in turn, would have a positive effect on the drivers of conflict, terrorism and migration. The human rights community built an arsenal to protect people. Now anticorruption activists need to do the same.

NEVER MURDERED ANY

OHANNESBURG - Police Minister Nathi Nhleko has distanced himself from former Deputy Chief Justice Judge Moseneke's Book.

In recently published memoirs, retired Deputy Chief Justice and liberation struggle stalwart, Dikgang Moseneke, mentions a certain young activist, Nkosinathi Nhleko. An advocate at the time. Moseneke represented this young activist in a politically-motivated murder trial in the 80s.

The activist had led the necklacing of a 78-year-old resident and traditional healer in a tiny Eastern Cape township near Queenstown.

The Police Minister, Nkosinathi Nhleko shares both a first and last name with the person mentioned in the book, a wrong impression has been created in some readers' minds that he is the person in question. According to Government Communication and Information Systems (GCIS), the police minister wishes to categorically distance himself from the person and incidents contained in the book by the former deputy chief justice.

"I would like to place it on record that I have never murdered anyone, nor been convicted of murder nor lived in Queenstown. I am definitely not the person Judge Moseneke writes about," said Nhleko. eNCA

Next-level crime fighting in Diepsloot

OHANNESBURG - Crime fighters in Diepsloot have a new weapon in their arsenal in the form of technologies to ensure better crime reporting and faster response times

Police on Wednesday announced a project with security company Memeza, which entails providing alarm systems directly linked to police stations, to Diepsloot house-

When the system is triggered via a motion detector or panic button, it sends an SMS to the local police station and makes a call to

Diepsloot Station Commander, Brigadier Koena Moichela, said in a statement that the initiative had resulted in a meaningful drop in crime and improved the relationship between residents and police.

In addition, a service called 'Namola' allows people to instantly call police via an app on a smartphone. Based on GPS location data, the application does not require the user to talk to the control centre.

Tshwane metro police had implemented 'Namola' to improve response times. The application was created by non-profit organisation Happimo, which develops "socially uplifting mobile apps," according to Namola's website

Dubbed an "Uber for police," users in

Tshwane had seen dispatch times drop from two minutes to around 15 seconds. According to the most recent national



tics, cases of murder declined 9.2% in Diepsloot, sexual offences declined 26.4%, while attempted murder increased 16.5%. "This pilot makes 'Namola' more accessible to communities where smartphone penetration is low, but feature phones are everywhere," said Namola's Katekani Baloyi. News24

Parly should decide McBride's fate - expert

Treasury 'welcomes' Guptas' plan to oppose Gordhan's application

OHANNESBURG - Treasury has taken Gupta-owned Oakbay Investments to task for raising issues relating to the court application involving Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan and the four major banks in the media and has called on the company to respect court

Gordhan has approached the High Court in Pretoria for a declaratory order confirming that he cannot intervene in a dispute between Oakbay Investments and the banks.

The banks had until yesterday to indicate whether they will oppose Gordhan's application on their decision to close down the company's accounts.

Treasury yesterday said it had no intention of conducting the case in the "court of public opinion" and would provide comprehensive and appropriate responses in court once Oakbay had filed their answering affidavits.

"It is peculiar in the extreme for the aforementioned respondents to address the issues raised in the affidavit by way of media releases as these make no meaningful contribution to the case at hand.

Presented

"The minister has presented his case under oath in an appropriate forum and it is incumbent upon the Oakbay respondents to do likewise should they wish to oppose his version," Treasury said.

It had noted the "numerous attacks" launched by Oakbay's lawyers Van der Merwe Associates (VDMA) on the affidavit filed by Treasury.

The lawyers wrote a letter to Gordhan calling on him to withdraw the matter and pay costs. Gordhan has declined to do this.

In the letter, VDMA, on behalf of Oakbay, accused the minister of wasting taxpayers' money on the application. "VDMA note that to spend taxpayers" money in a 'reckless and inappropriate manner' would constitute a contravention of the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act No 1 of 1999, which would warrant 'further action against those officials responsible for same'," the company said. It said the purpose of VDMA's letter and offer to Gordhan was to offer him the "opportunity to save taxpayers" money". Oakbay has said it will oppose the application, after Gordhan refused to withdraw it.

I was shot in targeted attack on students - ex-Wits SRC leader

OHANNESBURG-Police watchdog Ipid will investigate the shooting of former Wits SRC leader Shaeera Kalla with several rubber bullets during a protest on Thursday.

"Any police officer found to have contravened the law will be dealt with accordingly. We wish the injured student a speedy recovery," police spokesperson Brigadier Sally de Beer said in a statement.

Kalla wrote on Facebook that she was part of a peaceful protest on the West campus around noon when police "unleashed violence".

"I was shot 13 times in the back, at a very close range in a targeted attack on students," she said.

Protesters

At the time, protesters had their hands in the air and were negotiating with police not to shoot. She said she was in "extreme pain".

When News24 arrived at the Wits health clinic, where Kalla was initially treated, she was lying on her stomach and was in tears.

Student leader Busisiwe Seabe fainted at the clinic. She appeared to be short of breath.

Seabe, who helped Kalla get away after the first few shots, was also in hospital.

De Beer said the acting National Commissioner, Lieutenant General Khomotso Phahlane, had asked that the circumstances of her shooting be investigated.

Rebel leader could still return

JOHANNESBURG - South Sudan rebel leader Riek Machar says he could return to the turbulent country as early as next month, even if he has to enter the way he fled - on foot. He has begun speaking out again after a long silence, during which he trekked 40 days through the bush into neighboring Congo as South Sudan's capital erupted in renewed fighting. In an interview on Thursday with The Associated Press in South Africa, Machar said his country's peace deal had "collapsed" and a new political process is needed to revive it. Airlines bans Galaxy 'Note 7', 'S7 Edge'

In a statement issued on Wednesday, the airline said the ban was issued due to flight safety concerns around smoke and fire incidents, which had happened even to replacement handsets. In Northern Bahr Al Gazal, it is not the incessant cycles of violence wreaking havoc elsewhere in the country that concerns locals most, but the lack of rain and a deep economic crisis. At a clinic run by Doctors Without Borders (MSF) in the town of Aweil, Lucia Adeng holds her three-year-old son Wek Wol Wek, his breathing shallow and rapid and his skin paper thin around his emaciated arms. *Reuters*

MTN illegally moved funds out

ABUJA - MTN may have illegally moved more funds out of Nigeria than initially claimed. A preliminary probe shows that the amount of money moved by the telecoms giant exceed the R195 billion previously alleged. Africa's biggest network by sales has however denied the allegations. Nigerian lawmakers are currently checking documents dating back 16 years as part of the inquiry. Hearings between MTN, the Nigerian Central Bank and four lenders are expected to be held next week. eNCA

Newly banned Shiite group appeals in court

ADUNA - A newly banned Shiite group in northern Nigeria said on Thursday it was appealing in court against the governent's decision that observers are warning could spark sustained violence.

The Islamic Movement in Nigeria said the ban by Kaduna state officials violates Nigerians' rights to religious freedom. The ban, announced earlier this month, was made official with its publication on Wednesday.

"We are already seeking redress in the court and will pursue the case to its logical conclusion," the group's statement said. Nigeria is almost equally divided between Christians and Muslims, most of them Sunni. Tensions with the Shiite population are high after the army gunned down more than 300 people in an attack in December on the Islamic Movement in Nigeria's headquarters. The government has said the group provoked the attack, with the military

accusing it of trying to assassinate the country's army chief — a claim that human rights groups have called unbelievable.

The group's leader, Ibraheem Zakzaky, has been in custody since December.

On October 12, the group said 13 of its members had been killed when security forces and "paid thugs" attacked religious gatherings in multiple locations in northern Nigeria. Officials did not confirm the death toll.

Cops break up demo against draft constitution

BIDIJAN – Police in Ivory Coast used tear gas on Thursday to break up a demonstration against a proposed new constitution and briefly detained several opposition politicians, according to an AFP journalist.

A draft of the new basic law, which President Alassane Ouattara says will put an end to years of crises in Ivory Coast, but which the opposition derides as dangerous and anti-democratic, will be put to a referendum on October 30.

A vast deployment of anti-riot police in the economic capital, Abidjan, greeted protesters carrying banners saying 'No to the Ouattara monarchy', referring to the main architect of the proposed constitution.

The opposition has complained it was not included in the drafting process.

Police fired tear gas at the crowd after warning them they did not have permission for their protest. *eNCA*

Govt announces austerity measures

AIRO - Egypt has decreed a cut of up to 20% in government expenditure, a move its prime minister says is needed to set an example to follow during a biting economic crisis.

A Cabinet statement issued on Thursday says the government also has decreed a 50% cut in the number of ministerial representatives in Egyptian embassies, saying diplomats will take up their tasks instead.

Quoted

The statement quoted Prime Minister Sherif Ismail as saying the cuts in government expenditure would not touch salaries or money set aside for development or investment. He did not say how much money these measures would save. Egypt's economy is enduring its worst crisis in decades, with a ballooning domestic and foreign debt, double digit inflation and unemployment rates and a steadily weakening currency. *AP*

Woman beheads her two children

OHANNESBURG – Ugandan police are investigating the circumstances surrounding the beheading of two toddlers by their mentally-ill mother, who is from Kamuli District.

Uganda's Daily Monitor reported on Wednesday that Kamuli District police were investigating why a 25-year-old woman allegedly killed her two children, aged two and four. "The woman suspected to have mental problems allegedly picked her two children from Bright Future Nursery Primary School in Kamuli on Tuesday only to slaughter them like goats in her father's house in Mulamba Ward in Kamuli Municipality," reported the Monitor.

After killing the children, the woman who has been operating a drug shop in Industrial Area in Kamuli District, reportedly sent a six-year-old girl to the deceased's father's home in Kanange, about five kilometres from the crime scene to inform relatives about her offence before she fled. A police spokesperson, Michael Kasadha, said preliminary investigations indicate the crime was premeditated. *AP*

UK pardons thousands convicted under anti-gay laws

ONDON - Thousands of men who were convicted under now-abolished British laws against homosexuality are to receive posthumous pardons, the government announced on Thursday. Those who are still alive can will be eligible to have their criminal records wiped clean.

The ministry of justice said the pardons apply to men convicted for consensual same-sex sexual relations before homosexuality was decriminalised several decades ago. Men living with convictions can apply to the government to have their names cleared.

Justice Minister Sam Gyimah said the government was trying "to put right these wrongs". "It is hugely important that we pardon people convicted of historical sexual offences who would be innocent of any crime today," he said. Calls for a general pardon have been building since WWII codebreaker Alan Turing was awarded a posthumous royal pardon in 2013. The computer science pioneer helped crack Nazi Germany's secret codes by creating the 'Turing bombe', a forerunner of modern computers. His work helped shorten WWII and he was an innovator of artificial intelligence. eNCA

Military says it killed 18 militants in Iraq

TURKISH - The Turkish military said yesterday it had killed 12 Kurdish militants in southeast Turkey and another six in air strikes in northern Iraq, while also targeting their allied fighters in northern Syria.

Twelve of the Kurdistan Workers Party (PKK) guerrillas were "neutralised" on Thursday in the Cukurca district of Hakkari province, near the Iraqi border, the army statement said. In northern Iraq, the Turkish air strikes hit the Avashin Basyan region, killing six PKK fighters and destroying four targets on Thursday, it added. In another statement on its operation to drive Islamic State and the Kurdish YPG militia away from the border in northern Syria, the army said it fired on 40 Islamic State and six YPG targets on Thursday, leaving them 'incapable of manoeuvre'. On Wednesday night, Turkish air strikes pounded YPG fighters and allied fighters in northern Syria and the army said it killed between 160 and 200 combatants.

Trump heckled at New York charity dinner

EW YORK - US presidential candidates Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton ribbed each other at the white-tie Al Smith Dinner on Thursday

But what began as lighthearted banter between the two turned nasty as Trump was booed after describing Clinton as "corrupt"

Trump did get some laughs though: his biggest moment of the evening was his comment about the "biased media", which ended in a joke about his wife's plagiarised Michelle Obama speech.

"Michelle Obama gives a speech and everyone loves it, they think she's absolutely great. My wife, Melania, gives the exact same speech and people get on her case!"

But he lost the crowd when he called Clinton "so corrupt she got kicked off the

Watergate Commission". When boos were heard in the audience, he said: "I don't know who they're angry at, Hillary, you or I?", to which someone in the crowd shouted "you!" Clinton stayed classy, poking fun at herself while cutting Trump down to size.

paign issue, as well as her paid speeches to Wall Street. "I took a break from my rigorous nap schedule to be here, Clinton said. "Usually, I charge a lot for speeches like this." Later, she joked: "Getting through these three debates with Donald has to count as a miracle."

Event

In the end, she brought the focus back to the event and found common purpose with Trump: "Let's come together, remember what unites us, and just rip on Ted Cruz.'

The dinner is a fundraiser for Catholic charities supporting needy children.

It's held at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York on the third Thursday of October and hosted by the archbishop of New York. It is the last event at which the two US presidential candidates share a stage before the election.



Man slits throat in court

ANTA ANA - Moments after being convicted in a California courtroom of sexual assaulting a child, a former high school English teacher pulled out a razor blade and slashed his throat.

Jeffrey Scott Jones, 56, of Huntington Beach, slumped on a table in the courtroom and was rushed to a hospital on Wednesday with non-life threatening injuries.

"Right after the judge asked if we wanted jurors polled, both attorneys said no, and then he took a razor out of his left pocket and

slashed his throat," prosecutor Heather Brown told City News Service. "His head hit the table, and I thought he fainted. But then I saw the blood and the razor on the table."

Defence attorney Ed Welbourn said he was sitting next to his client, but did not see him cut his throat. However, he became concerned when Jones' head hit the table they were sitting at.

No one else was injured, the Orange County Superior Court said in a statement.

EU leaders agree to tackle illegal migration from Africa

RUSSELS - European Union leaders agreed on Thursday to step up their efforts to curb illegal migration from African countries with the aim of replicating their success in halting inflows from Turkey over the past year.

While migrants reaching Greece from Turkey have dropped to a trickle after a deal with Ankara in March, arrivals in Italy from Africa are increasing so far this year. Italy received 154 000 migrants last year and this year's figure is likely to be higher. Only on Thursday, more than 1 400 boat migrants were

rescued off the coast of Libya, Italy's coast guard said in a statement. To curb flows along the so-called central Mediterranean route, where thousands of migrants drown every year as they make the dangerous journey, the EU is offering trade deals and investment to African countries. "It is not just about money, it is about substantially improving the capabilities and the chances of people in these African countries and to give hope," German Chancellor Angela Merkel said on her arrival to the EU summit in Brussels. AP



RESURGENT MILAN CAN BEAT JUVE - BONAVENTURA

ILAN - Midfielder Giacomo Bonaventura said AC Milan are primed and ready to finally taste victory over Juventus when the sides meet in an enticing San Siro clash today.

Eight games into the season, Juventus look to be on their way to a record sixth consecutive Serie A crown after opening up significant gaps on key title rivals Napoli and

Roma, at home to Palermo tomorrow, are second at five points adrift while Napoli travel to rock-bottom Crotone looking to end a two-game run of defeats in the league that has left them seven points off the pace. Milan's surprising run of late saw the Rossoneri hand Chievo their first home reverse of the season Monday in a 3-1 win that moved them up joint

Bonaventura credits new coach Vincenzo Montella with helping to "end the chaos" that has reigned over the seven-time European champions in recent seasons.

And the Italy international believes the time is right to throw a spanner into Juve's tight plans.

"We can win it because it's a stand-



alone match, we're at home and they will have to be fully at 100% against us," Bonaventura told La Gazzetta dello Sport.

"And, our game is on a par with the top teams in the league."

Milan's last win over the Turin giants came in the 2012-2013 season, when current Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri was still at the helm after leading them to the 2011 title. Juventus have won all seven

league meetings since, as Milan bounced from one mini-crisis to another. Montella is the club's fifth coach since Allegri was sacked following a 4-3 defeat to Sassuolo in 2014, and Bonaventura says the ex-Fiorentina handler has brought "joy" back to the club.

"We've endured a few underwhelming seasons but Montella has brought back the joy of playing football," Bonaventura added. AFP

'l'm under pressure, but so is Pep'

ONDON - Sunderland Manager David Moyes says he is under pressure to turn around their poor Premier League form, but it is no different for coaches at the other end of the table. Sunderland are the only team in the English top flight without a victory and are rooted at the foot of the table, with two points from their opening eight games. They are already four points adrift of safety.

"I spoke with a lot of supporters this week. I think they understand what's required. The bigger pressure is from you boys (the media). The supporters have been excellent," Moyes told reporters yesterday.

"There's pressure on every manager to get points, whether you're Sunderland or you're Pep at Man City. I've been at the other end,

too -- I know what it's like." Sunderland visit 15th-placed West Ham United at the London Stadium today and Moyes has urged his players to be more ruth-

"I think we've been really disappointed because we've been close in some games. We've had games where we've been in front and could have picked up points," said Moyes.

"Strangely, if you win one of those games it would look a lot different and we would be talking in a different way. But we've not and that's our fault. We need to cure that and get it better ...

"One win would make a massive difference and it would lift confidence and get us much closer to the teams above us. It would give us a chance to start building." Reuters

ANCHESTER -Manchester United legend Ryan Giggs has admitted he would 'love' Luka Modric to sign for his former club.

The former Wales international was speaking at a UEFA press conference yesterday morning in Zagreb as he tours with the Champions League trophy. Giggs is an ambassador for the tournament this season, with the final set to take place in Cardiff next year.

Asked by reporters who the Croatian player he most admires is, he said: "Croatia have great players and my current favourite is Modric -I would love him to join Man Utd". Modric was strongly linked with a

HOLEY SNAKES! SIX-FOOT LONG PYTHON INTERRUPTS PGA TOUR

ALAYSIA - The perils of taking the PGA Tour out to Malaysia were fully exposed yesterday when play was interrupted by a six-foot long python slithering across the course at the Klang

Valley resort in Kuala Lumpur. The club, which opened in 1991, has often had sightings of wildlife on the course - and golfers were again put off their stride by another sociable creature during day two of the 2016 CIMB Classic. PGA Tour officials were quick to spot the nonvenomous intruder heading across one of the greens, with a well-trained snake handler swiftly onto the scene to place the python in a bag before relocating it to a more convenient habitat. Aside from that unexpected drama, Justin Thomas carded a six-under 66 to claim a two-stroke lead at the halfway stage, staying within striking distance of the tournament record he set in winning the title here last year. He started the second round in a three-way

share of the lead with Keegan Bradley and Derek Fathauer after opening with a 64, and followed up with a bogey-free round containing six birdies to move to 14 under, two shots clear of Asian Tour leader Anirban Lahiri.

Thomas, who won his first PGA Tour title here last year in a tournament record 26 under, wasn't entirely happy with his iron shots and wedges in the second round but remains hopeful of producing some very low scores on the weekend at the TPC Kuala Lumpur.

Thomas said: "The thing about this course, you can go shoot 12- or 13-under in a day so hopefully I can get it going a little bit this weekend like I did last year."

His rivals will be hoping for a choke - by Thomas, not the python - over he weekend.

Lahiri had eight birdies but finished with a 66 after a doublebogey on his final hole yesterday, leaving him at 12 under. Daily Mail

Haye could be in line for WBO heavyweight title showdown

ONDON - David Haye could be in line for a heavyweight world title showdown next year with the Brit potentially fighting for the WBO belt.

Joseph Parker and Andy Ruiz will go head-to-head in Auckland on December 10 to fight

The British boxer held the WBA heavyweight belt when he overcame giant Russian Nikolai Valuev in 2009 before losing to Wladimir Klitschko three fights later.

Haye has secured comfortable victories over Mark de Mori and Arnold Gjergjaj at London's O2 Arena since making his return to the sport.

ANCHESTER Vincent Kompany is
set to become the latest high-profile casualty of Pep
Guardiola's reign after the
Manchester City captain was left
out of 'he squad for the
Cha npions League defeat in
Barcelona.

However, City have moved swiftly to ease any fears over Sergio Aguero's future at the Etihad after he was only named among the substitutes for the Group C clash at the Nou Camp.

Guardiola has already marginalised two of City's title-winning team, sending Joe Hart on loan to Torino and freezing out Yaya Toure ahead of an expected departure in January.

It has emerged that Kompany was fit and available to face Barcelona following a brief comeback against Everton at the weekend, but Guardiola decided to put teenage defender Pablo Maffeo on the bench instead.

Kompany's Belgium teammate Kevin De Bruyne confirmed the decision afterwards, saying: "That's Pep's choice. He must have had his reasons."

Kompany's exclusion marked another low for the City captain after two seasons decimated by muscle injuries, and he looks unlikely to stay beyond the end of the season.

City were in two minds about keeping him this summer and the 30-year-old was injured in his only start under Guardiola in the EFL Cup at Swansea City last month.

Kompany is understood to have grown increasingly frustrated and was involved in an angry confrontation with Aleksandar Kolarov in training before the Manchester derby.

Klopp backs Karius to adapt quickly

"It is not perfect. He can improve. As a keeper you take a risk sometimes because the ball is bouncing." Klopp infamously celebrated a last-minute equaliser against West Brom at Anfield by leading his players to bow in front of The Kop and the German said it was unlikely there would be a repeat of the scenario.

"I celebrated the point and it was a little bit surprising for most people. I don't know at this point if I would celebrate a point again," he said.

"But we are full of respect.
West Brom is a very experienced team with a very experienced Manager (Tony Pulis).
They don't want to make it easy for us so we have to find a way to play them. We need to be angry, that's true, and be patient enough.

"We are ready for a real, tough football game. They are very good at set-pieces. We cannot choose their way and they can not choose our way." *Reuters*

ANCHESTER Manchester United superstar Paul Pogba has

"I am very happy to score that penalty and from a player like him to let me, it is big respect so I am very glad." Pogba also revealed he is enjoying life with his United teammates, and insisted the Red Devils will continue to work hard to improve.

"I feel comfortable with all of the team," he added.

Owen slams Rooney for losing 'nasty' streak

ANCHESTER - Michael Owen has criticised Wayne Rooney after the Manchester United captain allowed Paul Pogba to take a penalty against Fenerbahce.

United eased to a 4-1 victory over their Turkish opponents in the Europa League at Old Trafford on Thursday night.

Two goals from Pogba, one from Anthony Martial and another for Jesse Lingard put United joint-top of Group A but it was Rooney's decision to allow the club's £100million man to take a first-half penalty that irritated Owen.

The game was goalless until Jose Mourinho's side were awarded a penalty in the 31st minute after midfielder Juan Mata was brought down.

There seemed, at first, to be some commotion in the box over who would take the penal-

Rooney, as United's first-choice penalty taker, stepped forward to pick up the ball only for Pogba to approach him and take control of the situation after a quick word with the England international.

The Frenchman buried his penalty to put United into the lead but Owen questioned whether the midfielder should have been allowed anywhere near the ball.

"It grates with me a bit I must say," he told BT Sport.

Owen Hargreaves, another former United player, added: "He's [Rooney] taking this penalty I think isn't he [while watching the footage]. He's walking to take that penalty and then he gives it to Pogba."

Owen pondered whether Rooney would have done the same 12 years ago when he made his debut against Fenerbahce in the Champions League - the night he scored three goals

He said: "Twelve years ago this lad played against Fenerbahce. His first game ever for Manchester United [and] he ripped the ball off Ryan Giggs. He was telling senior players round here and he goes and scores a hat-trick."

Tomorrow he will play in the Tiebreak Tens exhibition event, which has seen him drawn in the same group as Marcus Willis, who will be attempting to qualify this weekend for the main tournament.

F1 LEADER ROSBERG SHUTS OUT NEGATIVE THOUGHTS

ONDON - Nico Rosberg closed his ears to negative thoughts and title talk on Thursday, even after Mercedes team mate Lewis Hamilton said he would "take it like a man" if he lost his Formula One championship to the German.

The overall leader refused to rise to the bait when asked whether he would see it the same way if triple champion Hamilton, now 33 points behind with four races remaining, turned things around and beat him.


"I haven't thought of that because I am planning to go for more race wins at the moment and that's it," the German told reporters at the US Grand Prix.

"And definitely such negative thoughts I will fully avoid. There's no point, that's not going to make me faster this weekend to think how am I going to feel if I lose. That doesn't work."

Rosberg has won nine races so far, to Hamilton's six, and has been repeating a mantra of taking each race as it comes without thinking of any bigger picture.

He needs no reminding of how close he is to becoming only the second offspring of a champion to take the title, after Britain's 1996 winner Damon Hill, but he is also determined to take one step at a time.

"It's business as usual this weekend," he said on his return to the track where last year he made a mistake while leading and

handed victory and the title to Hamilton, who has a great record in American races.

"Why lose energy and think about something that's still miles away and can or cannot happen? Better just stay in the moment and make the best of it.

"You can choose what you think about, can't you," he cont ued. "I choose to think about Austin and the weekend that I have here ... I don't suppress it, I just go for something else."

Rosberg, who won the last three grands prix of 2015 and first four of 2016, need only finish second in every remaining race to secure the title but he banished that thought from his mind as well.

"I definitely don't put any thought into that at all," he said. "I'm going for the win here this weekend, I'm not trying to bring home any second places."

CEFERIN PLEDGES TO PROTECT EUROPE'S NATIONAL LEAGUES FROM BREAKAWAY

ONDON - New UEFA President Aleksander Ceferin wants to protect Europe's national leagues from the threat of breakaway competitions.

Ceferin was elected last month amid talk of a future closed-shop Super League and breakaway cross-border divisions as some clubs seem ready to chase bigger commercial deals by moving beyond the bounds of national leagues.

"I am against killing national leagues. That is out of the question," Ceferin said ahead of yesterday's annual meeting of the group of European leagues.

The former Slovenia football federation leader said he is open to innovation - such as creating regional leagues - but within limits and inside UEFA's control.

"There are some new ideas and not necessarily bad, but UEFA should be involved in that," Ceferin said in his first major interview at UEFA headquarters on Thursday. "It should not hurt national leagues because without

national leagues I think football is dead." Radical change looked possible this year as UEFA was without a president during talks on Champions League entries and distributing billion-dollar annual prize money for the three seasons from 2018.

Some wealthy and influential clubs exploited FIFA's ban of Ceferin's predecessor Michel Platini by framing the negotiations around threats to break away, or force UEFA to lock a

top competition without the need to qualify via domestic competitions.

Ceferin took office three weeks after UEFA sealed a compromise deal that favoured the big-four countries: Spain, Germany, England, and Italy. It left mid-ranked clubs doubting where they fitted in the Champions League's future as broadcasters demanded more high-profile match-

ups. Daily Mail DAVIDSON PLEADS **GUILTY IN U.S BRIBERY** PROBE OF FIFA

URICH - A former sports marketing executive arrested last year during a US corruption probe involving soccer's global governing body FIFA pleaded guilty on Thursday to participating in schemes to pay bribes to a top official.

Aaron Davidson, former president of the Miami-based unit of Brazilian sports marketing conglomerate Traffic Group, entered his plea in federal court in Brooklyn to charges of racketeering conspiracy and wire fraud conspiracy. Davidson, who also agreed to forfeit \$507 900, is one of 42 individuals and entities charged as part of a US investigation that upended Zurich-based FIFA and the soccer world, and one of 18 people and two companies to plead guilty.

Prosecutors said the defendants engaged in schemes involving more than \$200 million in bribes and kickbacks that were sought and received by soccer officials for marketing and broadcasting rights to tournaments and matches. Reuters


WOODS STILL DREAMS OF ECLIPSING

We are consistent at the moment and I feel there is more to come out from our team,' Wenger said at his pre-Middlesbrough press conference yesterday.





The race has attracted athletes from as far as South Africa who actively participate in the Comrades Marathon.


The run is divided into three categories; which are the 42km, 21 km and the 10km. The main race starts at Mafutseni and the finish point is Mavuso Sports Centre.

Matsenjwa faces E10 000 fine if found guilty on the matter. Matsenjwa had previously blasted Manzini Wanderers Marketing and Information Officer Senzo Dlamini for making what he termed racists comments against his side, something that also resulted in the hub giants' mouth piece also being charged by the PLS.


