

he Supreme Court seems determined to continue with its second session with or without attorneys

Lawyers, two weeks ago, vowed to boycott the Supreme Court session, which starts on November 16, 2016, unless there is a permanent bench appointed. Their decision came after the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala made an announcement that the second session of the Supreme Court would take place for a month between November 16 and December 16, 2016. The lawyers said they would not attend the session because appearing before acting Judges would amount to legitimising the acting

judges when the constitution stipulates that at this time, there should be permanent judges for the highest court in the country.

However, the Registrar of the Supreme Court Lungile Msimango released a court roll for the session and indicated that there will be 61 cases to be heard by the Supreme Court.

The list is five cases shorter than that of the previous session where the session extended its sitting to two months at the eleventh hour. The reason for the extension was to allow the judges more time to prepare judgments because the cases were far too many.

"There will be a roll call on Tuesday November 15, 2016 at 09.00 a.m. All legal practitioners as well as litigants appearing in person are requested to attend the roll call.

Take further notice that no postponements will be entertained except for good cause shown on written application and properly motivated in open court," she said.

It will not be the first time lawyers boycotted courts.

They did so about five years ago where they complained of a number of issues pertaining to the administration of the courts in the country. They had even staged a walk out on

Supreme Court Judges in the boycott that lasted for about four months.

Msimango, when sought for comment yesterday, said she was locked in a meeting in the Ministry of Justice and Constitutional Affairs building. She asked to be furnished with a questionnaire by email, which she had not responded to at the time of going to print.

The Secretary of the Law Society of Swaziland Bongani 'Bhanyaza' Mdluli said the lawyers' position on the issue still stands.

"Our position on the issue was clear in respect of the Supreme Court, especially in the absence of appointments of permanent Supreme Court Judges. What we reiterated during the press conference, as being a position taken by lawyers still stands," Mdluli said.

It remains to be seen whether or not the session will be extended, just like it happened in the previous session.

The judicial Service Commission has not yet made any announcement on the appointment of Supreme Court Judges to sit in the session, whether or not, on acting basis has been made. The lawyers stated that they doubted that permanent judges would have been appointed at the time the session commences.

Law Society call urgent meeting

The Law Society of Swaziland has invited lawyers to an urgent meeting to discuss the constitutionality of the Judicial Service Commission.

The meeting, according to LSS Secretary General Bongani Mdluli, will be held at the Swaziland Theatre Club on September 30, 2016 commencing at 1330hrs. Also among the agenda would be the issue

on the constitutional appointment of Judges of the Supreme Court as well as the imminent memorandum by the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala on compliance with the law, such as subscriptions.

Announced

Lawyers recently announced that they will not be attending the second session of the Supreme Court because the Judicial Service Commission (JSC) has not made any recommendations to the King for the appoint-

ment of permanent Judges of the Supreme Court, as stipulate in the constitution of the country.

However, despite their stance, the Registrar of the Supreme Court Lungile Msimango, issued a roll and said the second session of the Supreme Court would continue on the said dates set by the chief justice. She said no postponements of cases would be entertained unless for a good cause and motivated in writing and in open court.

Repo-rate unchanged at seven percent

he Central Bank of Swaziland has decided to keep the bank repo-rate unchanged at seven percent, as expected by economists.

A statement released by Central Bank of Swaziland Governor Majozi Sithole said: "considering domestic, regional and international economic conditions and pursuing its price and financial stability mandate, the Bank has decided to keep the bank rate unchanged at seven percent."

This will come as good news to local consumers who have debt payments in formal banking institutions as they will continue paying the same interest rates on their loans.

Currently interest rates in the country stand at 10.5 percent.

Local University of Swaziland (UNISWA) senior lecturer and agricultural economist Jeremiah Rugambisa said given inflationary environment interest

rates are unlikely to be increased in the near term. The announcement was made yesterday in Mbabane after a meeting of the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) Monetary Policy Consultative Committee (MPCC).

Sithole said while inflation increased in August to eight percent, "the bank considers the increase in inflation as temporary."

"Salary increments above inflation contributed significantly to the inflation outcomes. Further food inflation also contributed to inflation increase," he said.

With regard to the food inflation increase the governor identified the recently amended government policy of restricted food imports.

"The government policy in the midst of acute shortages in the country was a recipe for local supplies to increase food prices. Supportive government policies for the importation of food items would help alleviate pressure from food price inflation in the near term," he said.

The recent government policy of increasing the mealie-meal importation restriction from 20kg to 50kg per household could then impact positively on inflation.

Sithole concluded by saying the CBS will continue to monitor the developments and will act accordingly to fulfil its mandate of price and financial stability cognisant of economic growth.

Lillian Zwane moves to housing ministry

 Long serving ACC deputy commissioner is now principal assistant secretary at housing ministry She once acted as ACC boss before appointment of Thanda Mgwengwe Was arrested for corruption related charges in May last year

ormer Anti Corruption Commission (ACC) Deputy Commissioner Lillian Zwane, has landed a new post within the ministry of housing and urban development.

Zwane who also held the position of Investigations and Assets Forfeiture Officer within the ACC, has already started work at her new work station as she now holds the position of Principal Assistant Secretary within the ministry.

This was confirmed by Chairman of the Civil Service Commission (CSC) Peter Mamba when sought for comment this week.

Mamba said the instrument used to deploy Zwane at the housing ministry has been issued and she has already started work.

"It is true that Zwane is now with

the ministry of housing and urban development, she holds the position of Principal Assistant Secretary," Mamba said.

Since its inception, Zwane has been with the ACC, an entity that has seen a number of high profile figures arrested for corruption related charges. However, she too was arrested sometime last year for corruption related charges after her subordinates (investigators) conducted searches at her home and office before hauling her to the police station.

Although the charges against Zwane remained unknown at that time, members of parliament once accused her of getting her job through corrupt means.

This happened on May 15, 2015, when she appeared before the Public Accounts Committee where MPs heard that Zwane never resigned from her position in the civil service when she joined the ACC in 2007 and that her secondment came after she was appointed Deputy Commissioner.

Benefit

The PAC heard that Zwane continued to benefit as a civil servant in that her pension was still accumulating yet she was also getting gratuity as per her contract with the

ACC. As of now, Zwane has been paid over E400 000 in gratuity from the ACC while upon her compulsory retirement from the civil service, she is expected to be paid terminal benefits, which would mean she would get double benefits from the same employer.

Our sister publication published numerous articles on Zwane's employment with the ACC, which was carried out much against the advice of Attorney General Majahenkhaba Dlamini and Auditor General Phestecia Nxumalo.

The auditor general, in a memorandum dated March 10, 2014, said Zwane should not be in office in as far as the 2005 Prevention of Corruption Act was concerned.

"The above mentioned act states that 'A deputy commissioner shall be appointed by the King on the advice of the Judicial Service Commission and shall hold office for a period not exceeding five years and may be re-appointed for a single term, on such terms and conditions as may be determined'," wrote Nxumalo.

She continued: "The deputy was appointed in 2008 to 2012 (four years) after the term have (sic) elapsed she was appointed in anoth-

er term of four months (it is not stated anywhere that the four months was an extension of the first term).

After the end of the four months, she was again appointed for the third time for another four-year term which will end in 2016. As far as the Act is concerned the officer is not supposed to be in office since she has been appointed for three terms."

Fired

Former Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Sibusiso Shongwe and fired Chief Justice Michael Ramodibedi, who were both dismissed from their positions because of being involved in corruption-related practices, played an integral part in Zwane's continued stay with the ACC.

Ramodibedi, who was chairman of the Judicial Service Commission when he held the position of CJ, influenced the drafting of a lucrative employment contract for Zwane, which gave her a monthly package of E77 000.

Rejected

Government, however, rejected the contract because it was not understood how she got to be specially given a contract yet her position was a graded government post whose remuneration is provided for under the Establishment Register.


The contract for Zwane was such that she was given a basic monthly salary of E45 500; a monthly housing allowance of 20 percent her basic salary, which adds up to E9 100; and 30 percent of her basic monthly salary (E13 650 per month) to hire security services at competitive commercial rates to protect her person and her immediate family. She was also entitled to an entertainment allowance equivalent to 10 per cent of her basic salary, which is E4 550 a month an amount that is the same as what she gets as a monthly inducement allowance. When all the allowances are tallied with the basic salary, Zwane was to be paid E77 350 monthly salary.

After the contract was rejected by government, ex-minister Shongwe tried to sneak it into Cabinet for approval but his attempts failed.

GOVT KNEW IT WASN'T READY FOR FPE

hen Swaziland crafted the Free Primary Education Act of 2010 it knew it was not yet ready to fully finance the FPE programme, hence Section 12 of the FPE Act permits schools to apply for top-up fees.

This is contained in the task team in fulfillment of the dictates of Legal Notice No. 125 of 2014.

The report states that the introduction of the FPE era was a contradiction in terms, in that it tended to make free education not free at all. Exacerbating the confusion is government's position to stop top-up fees in schools, yet there is a provision in the FPE Act allowing schools to apply for such. Government should have amended the FPE Act before issuing circulars stopping top-up fees.

On the quantitative [art of the study regarding top-up fees government issued circulars prohibiting the payment of top-up fees, and this had made it difficult for schools to operate effectively and efficiently. This was due to the non-availability of

sufficient funds to run schools leading to the quality of education being compromised. On the confusion surrounding top-up fees, it is important to mention that the circulars issued to stop top-up fees conflicted with the FPE Act of 2010, which provided for such. In the process schools were left in a dilemma because they submitted their requests for top-up fees with no responses from the ministry of education. The task team discovered that the office responsi-

ble for top-up fees could not action schools' requests because of the government's directive. On schools differences, the FPE and OVC funds are paid per child and this causes challenges as schools are not uniform in their set up, and they require diverse operational costs.

Affected

The most affected schools are those with small enrolment (less than 300 pupils) and those in rural areas who collect less revenue, yet running a school whether big or small requires the same basic needs.

Rural schools lack teachers' house, laboratories and utilities and are usually difficult to reach due to inaccessible roads. Special schools also experience the same fate as student with special needs require special costly care. As for reasons for topup fees, fees have remained the same for over a period of five years as there were no amendments incorporating yearly rates. With the advent of the VAT, the operation of schools became more expensive, leading to schools being unable to cater for their operational costs. The definition of OVC; it was discovered that the fund tends to be abused as non deserving pupils benefit from

Attributed

This could be either attributed to a lack of clarity on what an OVC is or to difficulty in determining the degree of vulnerability of a child On capital projects; it has been observed that since top-up fees have been stopped, parents are now reluctant to participate in school building projects. It is even now more difficult to penalise the parents who do

building of schools because they regard that as a 'top-up'. The task team also indicated that roads leading to schools were not well maintained. It was submitted that the ministry of education must clearly define the components that constitute a school before it is open for use. On current government contributions in primary schools; it is commendable that government provides stationery, text books and food in schools, however, government's contribution is insufficient to cover all the needs of the schools and the quality of stationery provided is said to be substandard resulting in schools incurring expenses as they have to buy stationery to replace torn exercise books and textbooks. The mass exodus of pupils to South African schools along the borders; pupils within the proximity of the border line have abandoned Swaziland schools in favour of South African schools. From the consultations it was gathered that the South African schools offer free quality education wherein their parents are not required to pay top-up

TSC must do its placement work right

The task team further observed that, on proper placement of qualified teachers, primary schools submitted that the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) should strictly place qualified primary school teachers in primary schools and desist from engaging high school teachers as this jeopardises the teaching and learning of foundation grades.

It was observed that there is an over production of high school teachers, e.g. History and Religious Studies, and following a directive from government they were employed to teach in primary schools, which is a disservice to the foundation grades. As for open days, it was observed that regular open days enable teacherparent/guardian interaction on pupils' school performance. The culture of open days must be cultivated in public schools. The task team noted that, on school curriculum, the country's education system was seen not to be in conformity with international standards.

Compliance

Attempts of compliance have seen the system changing from O' Level to Swaziland Certificate of Secondary Education (SGCSE) which was preceded by the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE).

On the regulation of mushrooming

colleges, the team noted that the country is flooded with unregulated colleges, which are allegedly offering substandard curriculum. It is worth mentioning that the Higher Education Act, 2013 is in place, what is outstanding is the establishment of the Swaziland Higher Education Council which will regulate the establishment and registration of tertiary institutions. On the issue of hardship allowances the task team observed that government needs to compensate teachers in the remote rural areas, especially those working under harsh working conditions such as where there is no accommodation, electricity, water, transport, etc.

Cutting costs without compromising quality

he task time made various suggestions on strategies to reduce operation costs without compromising the quality of education.

Timely payments of grants: it was expressed that the late payment of the funds by government contributes to the escalation of costs. Schools find themselves purchasing consumables on credit, and in some cases they divert the school funds only to find themselves victims of misappropriation. Furthermore, it is worth mentioning that schools delay in submitting the required documents to government for processing of payments.

The use of electronic media in teaching, learning and operations: the use of electronic media such as internet banking, e-registration for external examinations, e-learning, use of projectors in teaching and learning rather than the use of the paper and chalkboards in schools could greatly reduce costs. However, it was discovered that most schools in rural areas do not have the necessary gadgets let along electricity and internet connec-

tivity.

Cluster schools concept: the clustering of school would reduce costs as neighbouring schools would share facilities like libraries, transport, workshops, examination assessment, etc.

Building regional warehouses: the building of regional storages would reduce cost of transportation, reduce and eventually eliminate the use of the middleman for supplies,. It is worth noting that government has already built a warehouse in Shiselweni, and the construction of the Lubombo warehouse is underway.

Utilities and bank charges: it was expressed that schools are non-profit making entities, therefore they should not be charged commercial rates by SEC or SWSC. The ministry needs to assist schools in this regard.

Value Added tax: schools submitted that operational costs have escalated beyond their control due to the introduction of VAT. Fundraising programmes: it was submitted that

schools should establish parents-teachers associations (PTAs) for fundraising purposes in order to reduce their operational costs.

Support staff: stakeholders proposed that the support staff in schools should be absorbed by government. It transpired that schools flouted labour laws by either underpaying the support staff or being in salary payment arrears due to diversion or lack of funds, particularly small schools. This submission, however, may be unfavourable as it would mean an increase in the wage bill whilst government intends scaling down the size of the civil service.

Introduce book rental: schools should consider introducing a book rental system. However, the frequent change of books defeats the concept of reducing costs.

Agricultural projects: it was suggested that schools with enough land, and those on Swazi Nation Land should be encouraged to embark on agricultural projects to supplement their feeding scheme.

Why poor quality education?

n their qualitative findings, on visibility of inspectors, the team requested for the visibility of active education inspectors in all schools, as this impacts positively on the improvement of the education system.

It was revealed that the department was understaffed in terms of personnel, and the shortage of transport made it difficult for them to carry out their duties effectively and efficiently.

Due to shortages of accommodation, it was further gathered inspectors are

not fairly distributed across the regions. The hardest hit regions are Lubombo and Shiselweni as accommodation is scarce in these regions

Performance

On performance management system (PMS) it was observed that the introduction and enforcement of a performance management system in schools would help in improving service delivery. It was also observed that the underperformance in some schools is due to the extended absence of head teachers.

UNISWA MATH, SCIENCE GRADUATES UNFIT TO TEACH

n employment of qualified teachers it was gathered that schools have been flooded with under qualified teachers who are unable to deliver their mandate.

The departments mostly affected are Mathematics and Science, Design and Technology, Information Communication Technology (ICT) disciplines. The current Science and Mathematics graduates produced by the University of Swaziland are not only difficult to retain as teachers, but are not entirely suitable for teaching as they do not have teaching qualifications.

The ministry has initiated consultations with UNISWA to introduce Science and Mathematics degree teaching programmes for building capacity in these subjects.

Engaged

In addition, the University of Botswana has been engaged to partner with the Swaziland College of Technology (SCOT) which is working towards becoming a university, for the introduction of D&T degree programmes. There are also ongoing bilateral discussions with the Japanese government on engaging Japanese teachers in schools in the interim.

Repeating pupils: government must introduce a policy to address the issues of repeating pupils under the OVC programme.

School uniform: it was sub ted that schools must have one basic uniform instead of having different uniforms (e.g. uniform for Monday, Tuesday, etc). Continued on Page 8, 14

Monetary Policy Statement





On 23 September 2016 the Central Bank of Swaziland (Bank) with the Monetary Policy Consultative Committee (MPCC) held a meeting to consider the appropriate monetary policy stance for the Bank.

Considering domestic, regional and international economic conditions and pursuing its price and financial stability mandate, the Bank decided to keep the bank rate unchanged at 7.0 per cent.

The bank notes that inflation outcomes took a negative path in August. After two successive months of decline, inflation outcomes came at 8 per cent from 7.4 per cent in July, a 0.6 per cent rise. The bank considers the increase in inflation as temporary. Salary increments above average inflation contributed significantly to the inflation outcomes. Further, food inflation also contributed to the inflation increase by coming in at 17.4 per cent in August 2016, about 2 per cent higher than observed in July. Government policy that restricted food imports in the midst of acute shortages in the country was a recipe for local suppliers to increase food prices. Supportive government policies for the importation of food items would help alleviate pressure from food price inflation in the near term.

Further supporting the Bank's monetary policy decision was the improvement in the inflation outlook. Inflation

projections for the rest of 2016 have improved by 0.4 per cent from an average annual rate of 7.7 per cent to 7.3 per cent in September 2016 forecasts. The outlook is improving due to the strengthening of the Lilangeni against other currencies and low oil prices. The volatility of the exchange rate and food shortages though remain key risks to the inflation outlook.

The monetary policy stance should be seen as supportive to growth in credit extended to Businesses which has seen a turnaround from falling to attain 2.8 per cent increase in July 2016. Such support to business sector is critical particularly given the revised projections of -0.6 % economic growth for 2016. As at 16th September 2016, the country's Gross official Reserves amounted to 3.6 months of import cover. Fiscal stability remains a threat to the level of reserves and the exchange rate parity with the Rand, which is critical in supporting the Bank's monetary policy stance.

The Bank will continue to monitor the developments and will act accordingly to fulfil its mandate of price and financial stability cognizant of economic growth. The downward inflation path has been attained by earlier implemented increases in the discount rate.

The effective date for this bank rate (7.0 per cent) is 24 September 2016.

n the provision of basic infrastructure the team recommends that government should ensure that before opening a school for use it has proper infrastructure, learning and teaching aids, resources, and relevantly qualified teachers.

Moreover, government must intensify its capital projects programme for schools.


Regarding the visibility of inspectors in schools government should conduct organisational review of the inspectorate department to determine their staffing needs.

Furthermore, government should provide the necessary material resources such as accommodation and transport for proper execution of their duties. Relating to the performance management system, the ministry is encouraged to introduce and enforce a performance management system to improve service delivery.

With respect to employment of qualified teachers, the ministry is encouraged to pursue the initiative of introducing a Mathematics and Science teaching degree programme at UNISWA while on proper placement of qualified teachers the teaching service commission (TSC) is advised to desist from hiring under qualified teachers to avoid compromising the quality of education; on the regulation of mushrooming substandard higher education institutions the ministry must establish the Swaziland Higher Education Council. Regarding the support staff, government should consider creating a special account in which support staff salaries would be deposited to avoid the diversion of these funds for other schools' needs.

This will further accommodate small schools which have difficulty in remunerating support staff throughout the years.

On open days these should be made compulsory for all public schools in order to keep pupils' progress on check. Parents should also be encouraged to visit schools anytime to monitor pupils' progress.



On schools curriculum, the ministry should review and improve schools curriculum to be in line with the Southern African Development Community and international standards. In addition, universities and colleges-curricular has to be constantly reviewed for relevance, quality and market needs. Hardship allowances, on these, government is advised to pay the hardship allowances to teachers working in remote rural areas under unconducive working environments.

However, a proper definition of hardship should be put in place and the guidelines governing the allowance should be formulated. Coming to timely payment of grants, the ministry should give schools deadlines for the submission of required documents for processing payments of funds and it is recommended that the process be started as early as December in order for the ministry to submit to the ministry of finance in time.

With respect to the use of electronic media in teaching and learning, the ministry should introduce the use of electronic media in schools by collaborating with the ICT ministry. Donors should also be approached to donate the necessary multi-media facilities in schools.

With reference to cluster schools, the ministry must introduce and strengthen the cluster schools concept throughout the country to encourage the sharing of costs, such

as transport, library facilities etc.

Relating to the building of regional warehouses; the ministry is encouraged to continue with the building of warehouses in all the regions.

On utilities (electricity, water) and bank charges, the ministry should consider negotiating with SEC, SWSC for schools to be treated as non profit making entities.

Banks should be approached for non-commercial rates for schools. On the issue of VAT, the ministry should engage the ministry of finance and SRA with a view to amend the First Schedule to the VAT Act to include or make all key or core educational materials to be tax exempt.

Regarding fund raising programmes, parents-teachers associations should be introduced in all public schools for purposes of fund raising projects. On regulation of frequent change of books, the four year book life span should be adhered to and enforced by the ministry. Inspectors should be discouraged from writing schools' textbooks, as this is viewed as a contributory factor to the frequent change of books.

Government must formulate a policy governing the writing of school books to avoid cases of conflict of interests. On agriculture projects schools should be encouraged to embark on agricultural projects to supplement their feeing scheme, and for book rentals the schools must encouraged this to minimise costs.

Team calls for checks and balances to ensure accountability

he task team further suggested the introduction of checks and balances to ensure accountability and transparency in the operation of schools.

They made these submissions: Participative budgeting process; it was submitted as a must that head teachers should involve departmental heads, and school committees in the budget preparation process.

Presentation of regular financial reports; it was submitted that parents should be regularly updated on schools' financial reports. Parents-teachers meetings; schools should sanction regular parents-teachers meetings to bring the parents on

board on schools' operations. Financial management training; it was submitted that head teachers should undergo extensive financial management

training courses rather than a once-off short one week training. Schools were encouraged to comply with the Schools Accounting Regulations of 1992. Annual audits; the ministry was requested to conduct yearly or quarterly audits in schools in order to assist head teachers on financial management to avoid issues of misappropriation and/or embezzlement of funds. Employment of bursars; government was requested to consider employing bursars in schools who will be responsible for the schools financial management. Signing of blank cheques; head teachers and school committee chairpersons were advised to stop signing blank cheques. Schools development plans; schools were encouraged to develop and comply with schools development plans.

SPEAKING LANGUAGE OF THOSE NUMBERS

B ased on the findings and observations, the task team concluded that, on top-up fees, government should fund all schools core expenditure items and further allow gainfully employed parents/ guardians who are willing to pay top-up fees to do so.

Regarding the confusion around top-up fees, the ministry should explore strategies of managing the impasse by way of complying with the FPE Act of 2010 or by amending it accordingly. On school differences, schools should be zoned and allocated resources accordingly.

The ministry should conduct a survey of all schools so as to determine available resources and infrastructure against their needs. On reasons for top-up fees, government should annually factor in the inflation rate in the FPE and OVC grants. Government should undertake reviews of the grants every after five years. With respect to the definition of OVC the term OVC should be redefined

(i) orphaned child and (ii) vulnerable child or child who is both orphaned and vulnerable.

The screening of the children must be restricted to the school administration (head teacher, regional education officer, and school committee) to avoid abuse

of the fund. The DPM's office should assist by conducting proxy means tests and ensure compliance to the dictates of the fund. With reference capital project government should intensify its capital projects' programme for schools. Current government contribution in primary schools. government should purchase good quality stationery which will last the child for a year. Relating to the adequacy of topup fees, the ministry should review the FPE fee structure and incorporate additional items such as building fund, SNPF, transport, etc,. Secondly, a comprehensive fee structure for the OVC grants should be formulated as it is the case with the FPE.

On the envisioned and ideal free structure, as the government funding is per child, small schools are disadvantaged in terms of gross revenue.

These require special attention to operate efficiently. Staggering the implementation of the envisioned ideal fees, by 2015/16 (short term) use minimum fees for all schools.

In 2017/18 (medium term) government is advised to implement the partial zoning which accommodates the needs of small and rural schools. Finally, in 2019/20 (long term) government will allegate funds see schools.

Way forward: offer FPE to destitute pupils only

he task team recommended that government should return to the drawing board and redefine the concept of OVC and this would enable government to have a manageable number of OVCs who will be deservingly benefit from the OVC grant.

Currently, the grant is not sustainable, and vulnerable to abuse, as some of its beneficiaries have parents that are gainfully employed.

"In this regard, it is suggested that government considers offering free primary education to destitute pupils only, and allow affording parents to pay for their children."

The team further noted that evidence from a growing number of countries in all regions of the world demonstrates that the increasing

investment in education should be a priority to safeguard both economic growth and human welfare, based on this assertion, government should consider all schools' core expenditure costs to eliminate top-up fees. Parents/guardians who are willing to pay for their children's education should be allowed to do so.

This will help eliminate the dependency syndrome which is prevalent amongst the citizens of Swaziland. It is recommended that Section 29 (6) of the constitution on FPE be amended accordingly.

Government's primary focus should be on basic education as it is crucial to build a strong foundation for children's development as opposed to tertiary education.

Government should advocate for

equity in all schools by providing proper infrastructure, and roads leading to schools should be manned for easy access. Teachers should be provided with conducive working environments, with access to all teaching and learning materials.

This should apply to all schools despite their geographic locations. This will further help in eliminating congestion in urban schools and pupils' migration to South African schools.

Teachers training colleges need to be strengthened in terms of human capital development, and the curriculum must respond to market needs. The curriculum should be competency based and encompass pre-vocational subjects that help unearth practical skills from pupils.

The family and other mourners are currently preparing to lay kwaito's 'grootman' to rest.





I will come back to the SABC stronger'

OHANNESBURG - "I am stress free", former SABC **Chief Operating Officer** (COO) Hlaudi Motsoeneng told mourners at Mandoza's funeral on yesterday.

"I hear people saying Hlaudi is stressed. Hlaudi is stress free. If I was stressed, I wouldn't be able to deliver what I want to deliver. Maybe you are stressed yourself because Hlaudi is delivering." Motsoeneng has been mum following the dismissal for his application for leave to appeal against a ruling to set aside his appointment as the COO at the public broadcaster.

He said it was not the first time he was forced to leave the SABC promising that he would come back to the public broadcaster stronger. "When people were saying Hlaudi is out, you can't decide

for my future. If I leave the SABC, it will not be the first time I left the SABC, and I became stronger and stronger." Motsoeneng said he had delivered as the COO of the SABC. He said during his tenure, ordinary workers at the SABC were paid earnestly. He said he was happy to go back to the SABC as an ordinary worker.

"When I was born I was an ordinary. I want to make sure that ordinary delivers. It doesn't matter what position I am occupying. When SABC dismissed me it was because I was empowering workers."

Ordinary employee

On Tuesday, Motsoeneng reported for duty at the public broadcaster an "ordinary employee," after the


Supreme Court of Appeal rejected his bid for leave to appeal against a High Court ruling that set aside his permanent appointment.

"He tended to his services this morning," his lawyer Zola Majavu told News24 at the time.

The SABC board then recommend to Communications Minister Faith Muthambi that she appoint former COO Hlaudi Motsoeneng as acting COO until December.

This comes after Public Protector Thuli Madonsela found in a report released in February 2014 that Motsoeneng lied about his qualifications when he applied for the post of COO, that he hiked his salary from R1.5m to R2.4m in one year, and purged senior staff.

Despite these adverse findings, Muthambi confirmed his permanent appointment by the board.

In November 2015, the Western Cape High Court found Motsoeneng's appointment was irrational and unlawful and set it aside. The DA brought the application. The DA got a court order forcing the SABC to hold a disci-

plinary hearing against him, but he was cleared of the charges in December 2015. On May 23 this year, Judge Dennis Davis dismissed his application for leave 10 appeal. Motsoeneng then approached the SCA. News24

PREGNANT MOM MAULED BY DOGS BATTLES TO SAVE BABY

Ngwane Park woman, niece to traditional music maestro Mshikishi Mndzebele, mauled by vicious dogs last July may give birth anytime but is battling to save the baby while she undergoes operations twice every week at the Mbabane Government Hospital.

The dog owners, a Fakudze family of Ngwane Park Extension near Winners Chapel only came once to visit her a day after their dogs feasted on Thembisa Maphosa and they dropped a mere E100. Since then, they have not even bothered to make follow-ups on her condition. The dogs have also not been put down by the Manzini municipality nor has the municipality visited Maphosa, 26, who has and still continues to nurse her multiple injuries in the hospital bed with only her grandmother to provide support and prayers

A delegation of two elderly men arrived on the Saturday, the day after, to comfort her (kutolila) having been sent by the head of the homestead. She could not identify them because her face was completely covered in bandages but her grandmother says they only waited at the aisle and produced a E100 note before returning to where they had come from. They said it was money for groceries. They did not leave contact numbers or their identities.

Doctors began demanding clearance medical papers for the dogs that they were free from rabies but it was only after she had completed the rabies prevention medication that the papers were sent to the hospital and she could not say whether they were authentic. "Doctors started me on the medication in fear that I might be infected with the disease and also to try and protect the baby from further infection."

Medication

She added that doctors were continuing to give her other medication to protect the child being affected by her own treatment. They had been trying to put her through caesarian birth but were hesitant as she also goes for operation at the theatre twice a week to clean the gushes of wounds all over her head and face.

On Tuesday the doctors had wanted to operate her to save the baby but changed the approach saying they would rather apply other medication to induce normal birth because already patches of flesh are to be removed from other parts of the body to fix her face and head. They told her many incisions in her body would not be good for the baby.

It was that fateful Friday of July 1 that Thembisa went to purchase household items when a pack of vicious dogs came from the Fakudze homestead and attacked her while she was talking on her mobile phone. She had gone to Ngwane Park to visit a friend and was not



familiar with dogs that are left by their owners to attack passersby. This was the view held by neighbours because on the day the gate that is always locked was left open. By then it was already beginning to be dark at around 6pm, being winter.

It was reported the dogs ran towards her and rolled her on the ground feasting on her flesh from all sides. Her entire body is now covered in wounds and it was only a miracle that the baby survived inside her to this day.

As she screamed for help, people from the neighbourhood came to try and save her but the dogs would not let go having tested blood. It was long after that the dogs let loose the grip but extensive damage had already been caused on her body, sobbing close to lifelessness. As the neighbours tried to help, the dogs were also on the attack to anyone who came closer, this is according to eye witness accounts.

It was only around 8pm that she arrived at the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial Hospital but had to be hastily transferred to Mbabane Government



Efforts are also being made to have the matter reported to the Human Rights Commission of Swaziland to establish whether the rights of the citizen were not violated in the attack, so are the rights of the unborn child.

MPs now free to move private members motions

inally, Members of Parliament would have an opportunity to move their private member's motions after having been suspended for a while in favour of government business.

Clerk to Parliament Ndvuna Dlamini, said on Monday, all members were urged to attend an afternoon sitting without fail. Dlamini said he was directed by the Speaker Themba Msibi that the House would resume its business on the day. He said the Order Paper, which is the agenda for the day, reflects that they would be tabling of Sessional Committee Reports, tabling of Subordinate Legislation and Private Member's Motions.

The private member's motions were suspended in order to give priority to the government business, which included tabling and debating of Bills that were brought with a certificate of urgency. These Bills were mostly those there needed to be amended in order for the country to be reconsidered and have its status reviewed in the United States controlled Africa Growth and Opportunity Act market. This is the market in which the country's textile companies sold their prod-

Human trafficking victims have no home in SD - Survey

uman trafficking victims have no home where they can be kept in Swaziland hence they find themselves being in police custody.

While in police custody (not under arrest) they find themselves being robbed of their freedom while perpetrators of the crime enjoy their freedom after having been released on bail.

These were some of the findings made by visiting Michael Passarelli, the Project Director for Shelter and Heal Heartland Alliance International, following a survey he conducted on human trafficking in the country.

According to Passarelli, cases of victims of human trafficking should be prioritised by the country's Judiciary as part of his findings were they drag for far too long in courts, resulting in perpe-

trators of the crime fleeing to other countries with the cases not seeing the light of day.

"During the survey, I assessed the area on protection for victims of human trafficking and my findings were there is no home for victims with most finding

themselves in police custody. This is a very serious challenge which should be looked into," he said.

With prosecutors from the Directorate of Public Prosecution's (DPP) office present during the media briefing,

Passarelli also touched on the issue of cases that are not well prosecuted in the country's courts which sees human traffickers getting away with it.

He said Swaziland was amongst the countries that were on the watch list in as far as human trafficking was concerned. As compared to other countries in the African continent, Passarelli said Swaziland was a source and a transit point for human trafficking as a number of cases have been reported in the country.

There is a need to also look into improving identification mechanisms of human trafficking cases.

The findings were presented by Passarelli before Principal Secretary at the Prime Minister's Office Victor Nxumalo and head of Human Trafficking Department at the PM's Office Nomphumelelo Lukhele.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING CAUSE FOR CONCERN - FORMER SENATOR

handi Shongwe says human trafficking has now organisation been creating become a serious cause for concern in the country.

Shongwe, from the Forum for African Women Educationalists in Swaziland (FAWESWA), said most people are not aware of human trafficking hence the need for government to sensitise the public about identification of human trafficking cases.

Speaking in an exclusive interview with this newspaper after the presentation of findings by Michael Passarelli on human trafficking in Swaziland,

Shongwe said they have as an awareness about such cases.

"A lot of people do not realise they have been trafficked hence they silently suffer and a lot of cases are out there yet they have not been reported," Shongwe said.

Citing cases of internal trafficking, Shongwe made mention of cases where a young woman is taken for marriage by a man who pose as her lover, with the parents not even knowing that the woman married, in most cases through the Swazi customary teka

y the year 2022, Swaziland will be renowned internationally for the swiftness in exploring science, technology and innovation as means to increase the country's economic growth and capacity by developing a knowledge based economy and infrastructure, thus substantially alleviating poverty.

As part of His Majesty the King's vision to have the country attaining the first world status by the year 2022, the Royal Science and Technology Park at Phocweni is now about 98 percent complete. The state-of-the-art facility, that has been built to reach the world standard,

The Royal Science and Technology Park (RSTP) is a public enterprise created through the Act of Parliament. The function of the RSTP is to foster the conception of inventions and facilitate their patenting and help knit various elements of the R&D cluster together.

RSTP will provide a focal point for research, facilitate the links between research and industrial communities and stimulate the development of knowledge-based businesses through the incubation of techno-preneurship and hightech enterprises.

There are two divisions of the RSTP, these being the Biotechnology Park and the Innovation Park.

The Royal Science and Technology Park is developed to link education and training with the field of work with emphasis on research and development to support business enterprise. Part of its objectives is to lay the foundation for the development of a knowledge economy and also seeks to develop infrastructure to facilitate the development of science, technology and innovation through research and development

RSTP will foster the conception of inventions and facilitate their patenting and will help knit

various elements of the R&D cluster together.

The RSTP will also serve as a training base for persons with new, innovative skills and provide them with the environment to experiment on new technologies. 

MP CHECKS ON SIPA CLEANERS

legislator yesterday morning paid courtesy call on Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority (SIPA) who have an axe hovering over their head by Chief Executive Officer Phumelele Dlamini.

Sources said the legislator had come to find out whether the CEO had continued with summons to have the cleaners appear before her to answer on who was leaking information concerning their grievances to the media. It was gathered that the legislator had also promised to liaise with the chairman of SIPA board of directors with a view to find out if the CFO was still harassing the cleaners even after the matter had been reported not only to the board but also to Commerce and Trade Minister Gideon Dlamini.

On Thursday, the CEO issued letters to the employees calling them to her office for the witch-hunt. However the cleaners did not heed to the letters because the only time they signed contracts with SIPA was in January 2014 and it was only for three months with only one three months extension. However, the parastatal had continued to engage and pay the employees without contracts and the CEO went further to inform them their employment would end on October 31. It was only last week that they delivered to the board 17 grievances against the

CEO, which included complaints about harassment and intimidation. The cleaners say they will not be subjected to any hearing as though the organisation honoured its obligations regarding their employment.

It was for the second time they defied her summons on Thursday following they had also been required to report to her one-by-one on Wednesday after she had made available transport to ferry them from the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre in Manzini to her office in

Apart from the 17 grievances, the other staff members based at headquarters also submitted to the board 36 grievances. The cleaners, however, are at cross-roads whether to refer to their 17 issues as grievances because they do not have contracts with the SIPA but continue to do work such as other duties over and above their original job descriptions. Members of Parliament have also voiced their concerns about the modus operandi of the CEO with Minister Dlamini saying workers had every right to express themselves on what affected their work in the workplace. "So far we have not heard anything from the CEO but continue to defy her summons for fear of victimisation We shall continue reporting to work and taking up our duties as normal but we hope the board will come to our rescue," said a cleaner at Mavuso yesterday afternoon.

Swaziland is one of the countries in southern Africa experiencing the severe impacts of the most powerful El Niño in 35 years. The El Niño has been prolonged by the concurrent impacts of climate change resulting in austere drought, prolonged dry spells, poor rainfall and very high temperatures resulting in a poor agricultural harvest especially for the staple crop, maize. ousing and Urban Development Minister Phiwayinkosi Mabuza has met the Ezulwini Town Board councillors led by its Chairman Busie Bhembe this week.

The minister's meeting with councillors follows a letter written by the Town Board CEO Vusi Matsebula where he pleaded with the ministry to invoke Section 27 of the Urban Government Act to resolve what he termed as unworkable situation that had arisen between his office and the council.

In an interview with Minister Mabuza, he confirmed having met the councillors as regards the current state of affairs within the municipality.

"We have met with the council concerning the matters you are asking me about, however one can state that the discussions are at a preliminary stage for now and we are yet to deal with the matter and reach its finality," he said.

The bone of contention is the recruitment of the council legal advisors, where it is understood that the CEO even before approaching council wrote a letter to the legal firm that was providing legal services and offered to extend their contract.

That move is said to have been

shot down by council and has resulted in a standoff between the office of the CEO and council.

So serious is the situation that the CEO Matsebula wrote a letter to the Principal Secretary Clifford Mamba in the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development asking the ministry to intervene in the matter.

In his letter, he requested the ministry's intervention as per Section 27 of the Urban Government Act on the manner the Finance

Committee and the Council Board Chairperson handled the matter is recommending another legal advisor as opposed the previous advisor who had served for more than four years.

During the procurement of legal services to the local authority, the CEO argues that during the Ordinary Council meeting held on March 29, 2016, the office reported that the outsourced legal advisor's contract was coming to an end and the office was of the view that since there were court cases that had dragged for a long time, the advisor was handling, it would be fair for council to continue with his services.

This, according to Matsebula, was more especially because he had exceptionally performed exceptionally over the past years. Need

However, Council felt there was a need to advertise and publicly invite bids from legal firms for the provision of legal services even if the legal advisor had performed ins well since this would be fair and the evaluation tenders would have stated if this was good a thing that could be rearranged.

"The office duly complied and advertised and requested for bids from local legal firms with only three submitting bid documents and the office conducted the evaluation of the bids and submitted same to the Finance Committee, in the evaluation report the current legal advisor who had been serving for the past four years was recom-

mended by the management end ation team, but the Finance Committee recommended the ond placed legal advisor (CJ Littler Attorneys) for approval council, a thing that happened special finance committee meet ing," the CEO stated.

Matsebula said this all happen while he was out of the country attending a Young Africa Lead Initiative Conference in South Africa.

A clarification was sought by Clerk through an email in light the recommendations made by the finance committee, this according to the Matsebula was done more because there was a pending case which had been dragging in coun since 2014 that needed to be defended in June 21, 2016.

The matter in question is that of Derrick Dube vs the Ezulwini Town Council which according to the CEO is of utmost importance not only to Ezulwini but to all municipalities since it would form as precedence.

The CEO stated that the situation at Ezulwini Town Council was no longer conducive hence the decision to ask for the intervention of the ministry by avoiding to go the urban government act route of implementing Section 27 in feat destroying the working relationships.

MINISTRY CALLS FOR REVISION OF FPE ACT 2010

The ministry of education recommended that cabinet should revise the Free Primary Education Act of 2010 to incorporate expenditure items that were previously excluded and adjust fees with changes in inflation rate every five years. The ministry also offered a second option of cost shar-

This is contained in the original report proposed by the ministry on cost of primary and secondary education in Swaziland for the period 2016 to 2030.

Based on the findings, three scenarios are presented as options that could be considered by government in addressing top-up fees issue.

The first is that government continues implementing the fee schedule outlined in the 2010 Act. Under this scenario, government can opt to continue issuing grants to schools in line with the current FPE fee schedule. This scenario assumes that the current FPE grant is adequate to meet the education needs of learners in the medium term.

Government would continue to disburse the grant per learner in line with current FPE fee schedule in two equal tranches issued during the first and second term. This would be possible following the submission

of information on the enrolled learners in each primary school.

The total grant that is disbursed to a school will continue to be determined by the enrolment. Advantages are that the total budget spent on the grant will not change much. Resources to finance this option are very likely to be available. It is the cheapest option for government.

Disadvantages are that the quality of education will be compromised; some schools will not cover basic needs for learners such as payment of utility bills; performance of pupils will drop as education inputs will not be adequate resulting in demotivated teachers; the illegal charging of top-up fees is very likely to continue resulting in enrolment rates decline, dropout rate increasing, especially amongst vulnerable children and competition rates declining; low enrolment school will continue to be disadvantaged.

Grant

This is because the grant is also to a large extent determined by the school enrolment. The lower the school enrolment, the smaller the grant each school receives. This means that schools with potential to absorb more pupils in the future will not be able to develop or provide infrastructure and facilities.

These schools will not be able to

expand/diversify the curriculum; and more schools will fall in the debt trap as they will continue to borrow money from other sources.

The second scenario would be government revises the FPE fee schedule/package to incorporate expenditure items that were previously excluded.

This scenario attempts to address the issue of top-up fees by revising

the FPE fee schedule. It proposes a new fee structure that has additional expenditure items.

The assumption is that top-up fees are charged not because the grant is inadequate but because it is not comprehensive or does not cover all key expenditure items.

On implementation modalities, this scenario has two implementation options. The first option is that the state takes care of the full cost of education per learner. The second option is that a cost sharing mechanism is introduced as a way of protecting orphaned and vulnerable learners from dropping out of the school system due to financial reasons. The cost sharing will be between the government and parent/guardians.

The cost sharing would not apply to schools with half or more than half of their enrolment being orphaned and vulnerable learners. This means in the former, government will provide 100%. The cost sharing will be as follows:

Category 1 schools- more than 50% or enrolment is OVC =100 government (no cost sharing)

Category 2 schools -15% to 49% of enrolment is OVC=70% government: 30% parent/guardian

Category 3 – less than 15% of enrolment is OVC - 50% government; 50% parents/guardian.

These two options propose fees that are expected to be

adjusted with changes in inflation rate every five years.

The third scenario, revising school fees by adjusting for changes in inflation rate, which proposes that government revises the school fees by only adjusting the current FPE grant per learner for changes in inflation rate.

The current FPE fees are not influenced by changes in inflation rate. This means since the introduction of

the programme in 2009, the fees have been fixed. This scenario average inflation rate over the last six years. The average inflation over the last six years is 5.13.

On implementation modalities there are two implementation options that could be considered government under this scenario Government can decide to imple ment the scenario with or without top-up fees. If government opts the first option, she will disburse grant per learner in line with infli tion adjusted FPE fee schedule two equal tranches issued during first and second term.

This would be possible follows the submission of information of the enrolled learners in each print ry school. The total grant that is bursed to a school will continue be determined by the enrolment

If government opts for the second option which introduces a top-u fee, she will adopt the same im mentation strategy as in the first option except that schools will allowed to charge a top-up fee! need is justified not exceeding! set ceilings per grade.

The ceilings are set based on cost of education per learner as culated in scenario two. School will not be expected to charge up fees over and above the set ing. (See also pages 6&8)


FARMERS NOT WORRIED BY MAIZE IMPORT FROM SA

ocal farmers say the country is in so much deficit in terms of maize production that they are not worried about the importation of 12 000 metric tonnes that the market could be flooded. Johnson Mabuza, the member of the Swaziland National Agriculture Union (SNAU), Manzini region, said the farmers were not particularly dependent on sending their maize to the National Maize Corporation because there are other independent millers that offer a good price.

He disclosed that farmers were in constant talks with the ministry of agriculture to invest more in maize production especially in the irrigated farms of the Lubombo region that are currently concentrating on sugarcane farming.

This comes at the height of the stinging drought resulting from climate change and the El Nino phenomenon. "Our only worry at the moment would be to make maize expensive to the nation."



In the marketing year that started in May, South Africa itself was to import 2.7-million tonnes of yellow and 1.1-million tonnes of white maize, a country traditionally considered to be a net exporter of maize, producing an annual average of 12.5-million tonnes.

Data from Grain Information Service (Sagis) show that SA already imported white maize from the United States early March amounting to 1 330 tonnes.

Experts say the split between northern and southern hemisphere growing seasons means farmers in opposite hemispheres will try to take advantage of higher prices when a poor harvest is expected in a major growing area.

Important information to look at in world stocks is the stocks-usage

ratio, which is a measure of supplyand-demand interrelationships or the carry-over volume of maize used in a year as a percentage.

The global ratio is about 15 percent - 20 percent, or about two months of carry-over stocks. The US, the world's biggest producer, has a 13 percent stocks-usage ratio, or about 47 days. South Africa usually maintains an 11 percent stocks-usage ratio.

Affordable

"Since farmers were hard hit by the drought, they currently do not have sufficient maize and now are encouraged to venture into systems that will make the staple food available at affordable prices to the nation," Mabuza said.

In the meantime, some fields that were used to cultivate maize have returned to sugarcane farming at the fields near Majombe Primary while other irrigated fields near Siphofaneni risk catching fire as they are now ready for harvest but the cobs are still in the fields.

The Swaziland Agricultural

Development Enterprise (SWADE)'s LUSIP I were ready to harvest their crop of white maize mid month following a programme to rechannelling efforts from sugarcane farming into maize.

Swaziland's annual consumption per annum is 140 000 metric tonnes of white maize per annum to feed

the entire Swazi nation.



A deal between NMC LUSIP I was reached for a preferential price offered to maize farmers.


Swaziland, at present, is producing slightly over 81 000 metric tonnes per annum, 58 percent of the country's total requirement with a deficit of 59 000 metric tones.

SWADE concluded that under irrigation, the country would require approximately 7 375 hectares with projected yields of eight metric tonnes per hectare. Already, yields of up to eight tonnes per hectare have been achieved before under irrigation in the project development area (PDA).

To date, 42 hectares of maize have been planted at Incubekela Phambili with 22.5 hectares planted with SC 633 and 19.5 at SC 637. Other farmer companies like Ngcwaleni, Kuhle Kutentela, M&S and Ziyahle had planted 13 hectares, 12 hectares, 3.8 hectares and 13.2 hectares, respectively, bringing the total area under maize in the project area to 84 hectares.

Monkeys help themselves to army maize fields

hile the Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force is meeting Government half way in feeding the army personnel, monkeys are watering away those efforts as they are causing havoc at maize fields resulting in less yields.

The monkeys are damaging the maize plants at the fields located at Mbanana, Nokwane and Gcina camps. These are some of the challenges faced by the defence force in its agricultural project as contained in the Ministry of Defence First Quarter Performance Report for the Financial year 2016/17.

Aggravating the situation is the fact that the poor rainfall caused by the current drought situation, has negatively affected the planting of maize and beans in the farms, resulting in the army managing to plant a total of 107 hectares with 46.3ha being maize and 60.7 being

beans. The yields were reduced drastically as a result of the Monkeys damUSDF maize farming project hindered by invasion of monkeys that eat maize plants at Mbanana, Nokwane and Gcina army camps
 At least 43 hectares are cultivated by the army each farming season

aging the maize fields while the drought situation also contributed.

Visited this week, the army fields at Nokwane and Geina are ready for cultivation and the land has been cleared for this farming season.

According to insiders, the monkeys feast on the maize plants despite that they are normally chased away and this is seriously hindering the farming process.

The USDF converted what used to be an army air strip at Bethany Army Head Quarters to a maize field as part of its quest to sustain itself in terms of food.

It has also been gathered that despite the fields being dotted with scarecrows to stop wild animals destroying crops, the monkeys have continued to be a menace for years now within the area.

The farmers have faced an unusual threat from the hungry wildlife whose forest habitats are in decline.

"The animals are harming crops, almost entire crops have been damaged on a yearly basis, threatening to bring food insecurity for the army and those living in and around traditional forest areas," said our source when visited this week.

Adding, he said the monkeys do not spare any crop in their fields.

According to information sourced from the website, monkeys are our closest relatives in the animal kingdom and we have always peacefully coexisted and benefitted from each other. In fact, they are the second largest population in primates, after humans. But this relationship seems to have gone sour over the years.

The reason is because monkeys,



along with grey langurs and bonnet macaques, have adapted to urban habitats over the years as stated by an animal behaviour expert and out of the nearly 225 living species of non-human primates, these species have adapted to the urban way of life.

As monkeys started staying with humans, their population boomed. Experts say the reason the population of monkeys has multiplied after their natural habitat was destroyed is because of their ability to adapt to new habitats.

Other challenges faced by the USDF in their agricultural projects include the break- down of tractors and shortage of protective gear for handling pesticides, shortage of equipment for top dressing, insufficient rain, heavy rain which causes leaf disease and unreliability of transport.

LITTER 'DECORATES' IDLE GOVT LAND IN MANZINI

Thile the Swaziland **Environment Authority** has announced a series of regional waste indaba 2016 sessions across the four regions of the country, some unscrupulous persons are decorating an undeveloped property with litter in Manzini.

However the dogs seem to have an owner because some are kept under



leash during the day but released in the evenings to scatter the litter and terrorise passersby. The dogs are raised at the property that housed staffers from the malaria unit at the Manzini Regional Health offices adjacent Makhaya Convenient Centre.



Chairman


Since its inception in the 80s, Gamedze has been holding forth as chairman of the school committee with parents electing him at every elections year, describing him as a good leader.

At least that is the only plausible reason why a city with a fully fledged and stand alone traffic department is unable to collect clamps from Pakani's Intelpark to arrest drivers of vehicles parked on the walkways and also making deliveries while forcing pedestrian into the busy streets.

Federation of Swazi Business Community President Henry 'Tum' Dupont raised the issue at a meeting of business people in the city where it transpired that the municipality had no powers to effect arrests but the police because they do not have a metro police contingent. Kwaluseni now has new council

waluseni has elected a new council to stem illegal resettlements at Mbikwakhe following the death of Indvuna Musa Dlamini.

In the meantime, the Mazibuko clansmen are positioning themselves to re-establish their traditional authority in this high density peri-urban area. The Mazibuko clansmen are the original governors of Kwaluseni, under which Mbikwakhe is administered.

With the resurgence of illegal structures at Mbikwakhe, the Zombodze Royal Kraal summoned the council of elders from Kwaluseni comprising men and women who are original settlers in the area, known as Imisumphe, to elect a new council that will carryout the mandate of not only bringing order in the governance of Mbikwakhe but to also investigate and stop the mushrooming of ille-

As matters stand now, authorities want the establishment of a council of Imisumphe to take overall control on the administrative affairs of the area until the Mazibukos reclaim their authority to avoid infighting, kuthekana

gal homes and business structures. Menji Mazibuko, a Mazibuko elder, says it is likely that on Wednesday the new council will be officially introduced to Zombodze royal kraal for office recognition.

The Mazibuko clansmen are now working on identifying a King's liaison person, lincusa, to meet His Majesty King Mswati III with a view to reassume overall authority in the area.

Initially the Mazibukos were sidelined by the coming in of princes from Zombodze and they handed over controls to Prince Mtsakatsi of the upper house of princes. On the passing on of

Mtsakatsi, the Zombodze authorities somehow handed over the controls to the lower house of princes under Mciniseli and now there is intense feuding between the upper and lower house over control of the area. The last Indvuna, Musa, belonged to the lower house while the surviving descendent of Mtsakatsi, Gideon who was to be the heir in the royal household as entrusted by the Mazibukos, was sidelined. There is also Dula from Mciniseli's side who has survived Musa and is also calling the shots. It is in this regard, says Menji, that the Mazibukos want the lincusa, to reclaim their authority and end the

Mciniseli was given the controls, he committed a crime of illegally allocating land and was sent to prison but allowed to return home

infighting once and for all.

It must be noted that while

to bury his brother and never returned to complete his sentence, as a result the confusion is also centred on the reality that he could not possibly be given rights to run the affairs of Kwaluseni while he

was still a prisoner.

At some point an announcement over national radio caused a stir when the Ingabisa regiment during the reign of King Sobhuza II announced itself to be from Mbikwakhe. The King summoned the elders from Mbikwakhe and Kwaluseni to stand side by side and instructed those from Mbikwakhe to return to their homestead in Ludzeludze near Zombodze where they belonged and leave Kwaluseni elders to run their own affairs. However the princes encroached to Mbikwakhe to take advantage of the nearby hillock which they now use as royal burial grounds.

As matters stand now, authorities want the establishment of council of Imisumphe to take overall controls on the administrative affairs of the area until the Mazibukos reclaim their authority to avoid infighting, kuthekana. The illegal resettlements are by people who take advantage of the disorganised state of traditional authority in the area in that after committing an atrocity they jump to pay alleglance to the other faction thus surviving their crimes. Currently Kwaluseni also has the King's council which should be looking into issues of development and imercial activity and not traditional affairs. However they are said to overstep their margins to take advantage of the impasse and dictate on tradition. The problem of the Mzibukos began when an aunt, Loziga Mazibuko, was impregnated by a member of the royal household (the warring factions)but never married there, instead she returned home and was followed by her child whose descendents now claim authority over the Mazibukos.



HOW MANY JOBS DID SIPA ACTUALLY CREATE?



comparison of the ministry of commerce, industry and trade fourth quarter performance report 2015/16, with the first quarter report of 2016/17, hardly reflects a possibility that the Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority (SIPA) created new significant job opportunities in the last two periods under review.

However, in the first quarter performance report, SIPA reported that it created 540 direct jobs and an additional 10 seasonal ones through setting up of projects, with an estimated total of 800 jobs at full capacity.

"The jobs were created by at least three companies...who were migrated to an operational stage and would commence operations beginning next quarter," reads the report in part.

According to the ministry of commerce, industry and trade fourth quarter report 2015/16, under its achievements, SIPA reported that, 'at least three Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) companies with a combined total of 600 jobs will be created in the remaining financial year.'

Then in the latest report the authority reported that, 'three com-

Clearly, according to these reports, the first quarter report was only a not so significant development to the fourth quarter report, only the job opportunity projections were increased; otherwise the recent report is the duplication of the first one.

Evidently, there were no new sig-

nificant jobs created by SIPA, thus far. Only the same pending one have been presented as jobs created in the last two reports. And so far only three FDIs have been attracted by SIPA.

Surprisingly, the authority did not report any challenges with regards to job creation in the latest report, this is quite absurd! Is it because the authority had it all easy within such a volatile global environment? What happened to the other investors who were launched by SIPA in the past years and months? We have neither heard from them after the launch nor saw some of their products in the markets. What is really happening? Someone has to account for that. While SIPA cannot solely shoulder the blame, their reporting is quite misleading.

Economists say there is still a need to shift the structure of the economy from being largely consumption-driven to one that is increasingly led by investments. There is a need to improve the efficiency of public investment to serve as a catalyst for greater private sector participation; connect the regions to facilitate access to markets and basic services; and address critical constraints to investments, particularly high power cost, poor infrastructure, policy inconsistencies, and administrative inefficiencies. This is long overdue.

Adding, he said the corporation's exclusive right to establish, construct, maintain and operate the national backbone, especially the international gateway, was not meant to create a monopoly, but took into considering other factors like state security, "as we move forward and technology develops there will be no monopoly.' Asked if that would not create a price squeeze for other players, Dlamini responded in the negative, saying the regulator, SCCOM, would continue to play its watchdog role on price regulation.

He said while the costs would

be difficult to control, they were looking at forming alliances with undersea cable companies or even to buy equity, which could be difficult for other players who were not part of the network.

"We can also make use opportunities presented by organisations like International Telecommunications Union (ITU)."

In essence, SCCOM Chief Executive Officer Thulani Fakudze, said they were working on processes to ensure that Swazis enjoyed competitive prices in the industry., Of course, they will have to consider the forces at play, including the costs incurred when rendering that service.



he idea of a First World should not just remain an idea, but needs to be transformed into reality.

However, given the few years remaining and the challenges we continue to face as a country, it appears His Majesty the King's vision is under serious threat.

Currently, we seem to fail to strike balance in growth between what we want to achieve by 2022 whilst also dealing with our immediate needs.

We find ourselves focusing or investing in infrastructure that will make us appear to be a developed economy whilst on the ground we still face third world challenges, such as; high rate of unemployment, sluggish economic growth, poverty, challenges in health and failing to deal with natural disasters like drought and climate change.

Investing in infrastructure is not necessarily bad because it is one way by which government can stimulate economic activity.

It is not that on their own they are bad, it is just that when compared with other pressing societal needs, they are viewed as not being a priority.

The other element that seems not be working well for us at the moment, is the sluggish rate at which we attract foreign investment.

In the past few years, as Finance Minister Martin Dlamini said this year's budget speech, despite some sluggish economic growth, we have managed to achieve the following milestones;

• Universal Primary Education now covers Grades 1 to 7, thus reaching the target we set ourselves in the Constitution;

 Anti-Retroviral Therapy take up has more than doubled since 2009, with about 105,000 people with HIV accessing free treatment;

• The proportion of Swazis with access to clean water has increased to 76 percent;

• and Our business and economic environment has generally improved, thanks to improved fiscal conditions and reforms, coupled with peace and security. This augurs well for our future economic growth prospects.

It appears though that despite these achievements we are now faced with a cash-flow crisis.

A cash-flow crisis as once experienced in 2010/11 coupled with slow rate of attracting foreign direct inventors would set us back.

It is not that this situation was not envisaged. In 2010 we developed a five year Fiscal Adjustment Roadmap (FAR) whose aim was to implement measures and reforms over the medium term to deal with the challenges of a global financial crisis.

Based on that deteriorating fiscal outlook, which pointed at major declines in SACU revenues, a comprehensive plan was put together to reverse the tide.

The plan stated the following: "One of the fundamentals of this document is to bring the

fiscal position to sustainable levels through revenue enhancement and better expenditure control, particularly the relatively large wage bill, and create space for the Government's commitment to increase spending in the health and education sectors. The roadmap also focuses on efforts to promote a robust private sector to complement the envisaged more efficient public sector in mobilising domestic and foreign investment, diversify the economy, and accelerate employment creation. This requires Government to not only 'tighten the belt' but also to make critical decisions on its revenue and spending priorities in the medium term and seek more innovative methods of meeting its commitments, realise savings, and improve efficiency. The need for this approach comes at a time when the country is faced with serious socio-economic challenges, which include food insecurity, high unemployment, sluggish economic activity,

poverty and a high prevalence of HIV and AIDS and TB. These challenges call for an increase in government spending to deal with them effectively and this is increasingly difficult given the current domestic revenue generation capacity."

Strategies

It further stated: "This roadmap is proposing some strategies to grow the economy and therefore sustainable government revenue. Such strategies include improving labour intensive foreign direct investment (FDI) for export development, addressing the bottlenecks in the mining sector, enhancing and exploiting Swaziland's tourism potential, and facilitating trade through extended border hours and the harmonisation of border procedures. In developing the proposed reforms, the FAR draws extensively on policies and reforms in the National Development Strategy (NDS), Vision 2022 covering the period 1997-2022, the Poverty Reduction Strategy and

Action Programme (PRSAP)."

We have continued to struggle with containing our expenditure patterns. Today we find ourselves with a cash-flow crisis because we decided to further loosen the wage bill.

One reason advanced by those leading the government machinery is that when public servants are happy, it would result in efficiencies and increased productivity.

That narrative whilst aimed at appeasing the public service fails to acknowledge that government alone is not in the business of generating revenues, but mainly focused or service delivery. Such a narrative can be true in the private sector. So we need more private sector participation in the economy, which will in turn result in high revenues to pay the public servants.

Cash flow

The government action which has now resulted in this cash-flow crisis is not different from the fact that *sesidla inhlanyelo*.

Late as it maybe, we can still revert back to the plan, it can still work as it is still relevant even today.

One of our major challenges as a country is not failure to identify our challenges, but our failure to implement and stick to the plan as agreed. All our institutions are guilty of taking too long to act on programmes that have been articulated through either our roadmap for economic recovery or the National Development Strategy. Take for instance the transformation of the Information Communication

Technology (ICT) sector.

It was envisaged way back 10 years ago when we produced the National Information and Communication Infrastructure Policy that this sector needs to be transformed. An implementation strategy was drafted in 2012 but it had not been implemented until the relationship between the Swaziland Post and Telecommunications Corporation (SPTC) and

Swazi MTN became clear that it was no longer tenable. At the heart of the ICT sector transformation has been the concern from investors and consumers that the communication costs were too high in this country.

Now we find ourselves racing against time to ensure that SPTC is unbundled and legally divorced from its Joint Venture Agreement marriage with Swazi MTN.

This was the same scenario when we had to launch the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) after years of being advised to do sowedid not until SACU started to catch a cold.

Harass

SRA's image suffered from there as people saw it as an entity that came to harass them, yet operating in a different time and context, we would be appreciating its existence.

For an entity like SRA to work well and for government to offer tax holidays and incentives to taxpayers it needs a robust economy.

It is unfortunate that as things stands, faced with a shrinking tax base, they are seen as a threat to the existence of the very same companies and individuals it is supposed to harness.

In order to reach our intended target or a First World status, we need to start to act faster and think on our feet.

It is unconceivable that we have now taken two years to deal with the loss of AGOA status. Our legislators have been of disservice to the country that needs all sorts of markets in order to grow its economy.

Let's hope the three bills that are being discussed by stakeholders to unbundle SPTC will not take forever. This economy needs some stimulus to get on its feet. If the ICT sector is such a stimuli, then let's give it life.

Failure to take a decision is a decision on its own. We must therefore not fail to do what is good for this Kingdom, it is the only one we have.

Dealing with Diabetes

What is insulin?

nsulin according Diabetes UK is a hormone made in the pancreas, an organ located behind the stomach.

The pancreas contains clusters of cells called islets. Beta cells within the islets make insulin and release it into the blood.

Insulin plays a major role in metabolismthe way the body uses digested food for energy. The digestive tract breaks down carbohydrates—sugars and starches found in many foods-into glucose. Glucose is a form of sugar that enters the bloodstream. With the help of insulin, cells throughout the body absorb glucose and use it for energy.

Insulin's role in blood glucose control

When blood glucose levels rise after a meal, the pancreas releases insulin into the blood. Insulin and glucose then travel in the blood to cells throughout the body.

Insulin helps muscle, fat, and liver cells absorb glucose from the bloodstream, lowering blood glucose levels.

Insulin stimulates the liver and muscle tissue to store excess glucose. The stored form of glucose is called glycogen.

Insulin also lowers blood glucose levels by reducing glucose production in the liver.

In a healthy person, these functions allow blood glucose and insulin levels to remain in the normal range.

The pancreas contains clusters of cells called islets. Beta cells within the islets make insulin and release it into the blood.

What is insulin resistance?


Diabetes South Africa explains Insulin resistance as a condition in which the body produces insulin but does not use it effectively. When people have insulin resistance, glucose builds up in the blood instead of being absorbed by the cells, leading to type2 diabetes or prediabetes.

Most people with insulin resistance don't know they have it for many years—until they develop type2 diabetes, a serious, lifelong disease. The good news is that if people learn they have insulin resistance early on, they can often prevent or delay diabetes by making changes to their lifestyle.

Insulin resistance can lead to a variety of serious health disorders. The section "What is metabolic syndrome?"-Provides more information about other health disorders linked to insulin resistance.

Signs and symtoms of insulin resistance

- Brain fogginess and inability to focus
- High blood sugar
- Intestinal bloating most intestinal gas is produced from carbohydrates in the diet, mostly those that humans cannot digest and
- Sleepiness, especially after meals
- Weight gain, fat storage, difficulty losing weight - for most people, excess weight is from high fat storage; the fat in IR is generally stored in and around abdominal organs in both males and females; it currently is

suspected that hormones produced in that fat are a precipitating cause of insulin resistance

- Increased blood triglyceride levels
- Increased blood pressure; many people with hypertension are either diabetic or prediabetic and have elevated insulin levels due to insulin resistance; one of insulin's effects is to control arterial wall tension throughout the body
- Increased pro-inflammatory cytokines associated with cardiovascular disease
- Depression: due to the deranged metabolism resulting from insulin resistance, psychological effects, including depression, are not uncommon
- Acanthosis nigricans
- Increased hunger

What happens with insulin resistance?

In insulin resistance, muscle, fat, and liver cells do not respond properly to insulin and thus cannot easily absorb glucose from the bloodstream. As a result, the body needs higher levels of insulin to help glucose enter

The beta cells in the pancreas try to keep up with this increased demand for insulin by producing more. As long as the beta cells are able to produce enough insulin to overcome the insulin resistance, blood glucose levels stay in the healthy range.

Over time, insulin resistance can lead to type 2 diabetes and prediabetes because the beta cells fail to keep up with the body's increased need for insulin. Without enough insulin, excess glucose builds up in the bloodstream, leading to diabetes, prediabetes, and other serious health disorders.

What causes insulin resistance?

Although the exact causes of insulin resistance are not completely understood, scientists think the major contributors to insulin resistance are excess weight and physical inactivity.

Excess weight

Some experts believe obesity, especially excess fat around the waist, is a primary cause of insulin resistance. Scientists used to think that fat tissue functioned solely as energy storage. However, studies have shown that belly fat produces hormones and other substances that can cause serious health problems such as insulin resistance, high blood pressure, imbalanced cholesterol, and cardiovascular disease (CVD).

Belly fat plays a part in developing chronic, or long-lasting, inflammation in the body. Chronic inflammation can damage the body over time, without any signs or symptoms. Scientists have found that complex interactions in fat tissue draw immune cells to the area and trigger low-level chronic inflammation. This inflammation can contribute to the development of insulin resistance, type2 diabetes, and CVD. Studies show that losing the weight can reduce insulin resistance and prevent or

delay type 2 diabetes.

Physical inactivity

Many studies have shown that physical inactivity is associated with insulin resistance, often leading to type2 diabetes. In the body, more glucose is used by muscle than other tissues. Normally, active muscles bum their stored glucose for energy and refill their reserves with glucose taken from the bloodstream, keeping blood glucose levels in balance.

Studies show that after exercising, muscles become more sensitive to insulin, reversing insulin resistance and lowering blood glucose levels. Exercise also helps muscles absorb more glucose without the need for insulin. The more muscle a body has, the more glucose it can burn to control blood glucose levels.

Other causes

According to National Institute of Diabetes and digestive and kidney disease in America, other causes of insulin resistance may include ethnicity; certain diseases; hormones; steroid use; some medications; older age; sleep problems, especially sleep apnea; and cigarette smoking.

Old Mutual National Choir Festival:

FEELIT, THE NCF REGIONAL ELIMINATIONS ARE HERE

sangweni Hall, at Esibayeni Lodge, in Matsapha will be the battleground as local choirs go head to head in the Old Mutual National Choir Festival (NCF) Regional Eliminations this Sunday.

The choirs will be competing for spots in the NCF finals slated for the Ellis Park Indoor Arena in Johannesburg come December. Eleven choirs from each section will battle it out at the finals after all is done and dusted at the regional elimination stage. The ten choirs that will come out from the regions will be joined by last year's champions from both sections to make the total of eleven choirs going to Johannesburg. The two choirs who gain automatic entry by virtue of being last year's champions are SA Singers and Simon Estes Alumni Choir in large and standard section, respectively.

In the local front Mbabane Methodist Church Choir (MMCC) and St Florence Methodist Church Choir will be all out to defend their championship as they were eventual winners in last year's regional eliminations. Regional Champions in the standard category gain automatic entry to the finals while qualification for the finals in the large section is dependent on the number of points the choir gets which makes it qualify for the top ten.

Five Choirs will be competing in the large section while ten will battle for the top in the standard section. Defending champions MMCC will be competing against His Majesty's Correctional Services Choir, Manzini Choir, Sweet Sounds and Royal Swaziland Police Choir.

The 10 choirs to compete in the standard section in their order of performance are Lobamba Choral Choir, Sishayingoma Choristers, FTM Melodies Choir, RSSC Choristers, Clockwork Giant Choir, Harmonious Chorus Singers, Swaziland Mighty Voices, Masibuye Choral Voices, St Florence Catholic Church Choir and Royal Swazi Spa Choir.

The local choral music association under the leadership of Vusi Maziya aka Jozana has urged local choirs to work towards attaining a good number of points and compete with the choirs who are currently in the top ten of the log instead of competing



among themselves. Maziya and his association are targeting that at least three choirs qualify in this 39th instalment of the most celebrated choral music competition.

The local elimination is the most anticipated one among choral music lovers as local choirs are known to be competitive, having qualified two choirs to the finals for two consecutive years.

The one winning choir will join African Sweet Melodies (Gauteng), Belcanto Singers (Eastern Cape), Diamond City Chorus (Northern Cape), Chitungwiza Harmony Singers (Zimbabwe) and Prince Mshiyeni Choir (Kwazulu Natal), Gaborone Youth Singers (Botswana) and CUT Choir (Free State) which have already secured their places in the finals.

There will be only two regional eliminations left after Swaziland which put the choirs to make it to the top ten at an advantage of being among those going to the finals. The two remaining provinces are Western Cape who are competing next Sunday, October 2 at Artscape Main Opera House in Cape Town and Mpumalanga who are competing on Safurday, October 8 at the Civic Centre in Nelspruit.

There are 10 songs prescribed for the competing choirs in the respective categories from which the choirs are expected to

choose from. Western pieces for the large category include Voici Des roses + Songe de faust from La damnation de faust by Berlioz. Rex tremendae + Sanctus from Requiem by Berlioz and Inflammatus + In sempiternasaecula from Stabat mater by Rossini. In African pieces, there are two songs which are Kwabanjalo by JSP Motuba and Bulang Dikgoro also by JSP Motuba

In the standard category, choirs for the Western pieces are expected to choose from Ronde Des paysans from La damnation de faust by Berlioz, Chant de la fete de paques from La damnation de faust by Berlioz and Agnusdei from St. Cecilia Mass by Gounod For the Africa piece, the choirs are expected to choose between Mokgosiga se molaletsa by H K Pule and Selelosaset Šhaba also composed by H K Pule.


VUSI MAHLASELA

VELEMSENI




Struggles

tis utterly shocking and uncalled-for the manner in which students at our institutions of higher learning have been conducting themselves at some universities following the minister of higher education and training's recent announcement on what government is doing and how his department will be intervening to assist students from the poor, working and the middle class families with funding in the year 2017.

It can never be right and it is completely unacceptable that every time students opt to protest, they see a need to destroy property. The destruction of property and hurling of insults at managers and leaders by students does not bring any of us closer to the solutions we are seeking, irrespective of the nature of the challenges we are facing. This message has become a song sung by almost everyone every day now, but it seems to be falling on deaf ears. One starts to wonder whether students are listening to these kind of messages, or is there a possibility they just don't care?

This "don't care" attitude is what one picks from some students every time they get an opportunity to provide sound-bites to the media on the ground during these violent protests. It is startling some of the statements these students make. It is, however, this kind of attitude that will bring the higher education system, and ultimately this country to its knees.

This writer attended the media briefing in Pretoria where Minister Nzimande took the media and the country through the plans put in place by government to address the 2017 fee support to students from poor, working and the middle class families. This writer attended the briefing not only because he is an employee in Dr Nzimande's higher education and training department, but because he wanted to get the feel of the environment during the briefing and hear the statement from the horse's mouth. But also more importantly, this writer attended the minister's briefing because he did not want to get first hand reports from the media.

Without getting too much into it, what role is the media playing in assisting not just government, but South Africa at large to calm the current situation at our institutions of higher learning?

It is so disappointing to read and listen to some of the media reports and the questions journalists ask regarding the fee free education matter, particularly during television and radio interviews. You listen to this interviews you will be convinced some of the media houses are acting as the mouthpiece of the "feesmustfall movement. How about the media unpacking the work government has done and continues doing to address the current challenges in the higher education system? Our media can be so negative at times and unnecessarily fuel fire to the challenges this country is facing.

Dr Nzimande tirelessly spent hours doing interviews with a variety of media houses on the same day he briefed the media and later in the evening of the same date he was on eNCA's Justice Factor for an interview on the same matter.

This writer had a late night sleep because he wanted to watch the Justice Factor interview with Minister Nzimande. One gets a view that the manner in which questions were asked by the host, his point was to probably embarrass and portray the Minister and his department as

STUDENTS MUST APPRECIATE GOVERNMENT'S INTERVENTION IN 2017 FEE ADJUSTMENTS

...it is imperative that the mandate and the decisions of central banks are understood and respected. Their mandate is linked to a country's economic fortunes



having failed to meet the demands of students. The host tried so hard to portray the Minister and his department as not taking full responsibility and passing the buck to universities. This is not to rubbish the host; this writer enjoys reading the host's articles in print media, it is just that the host was quite disappointing during this interview.

On the other hand, one cannot help but doubt whether our students, particularly those currently busy protesting took time to engage the minister's statement released on the day of the announcement. The Department of Higher Education and Training made sure the minister's statement was shared on all platforms available, particularly for students at various Universities and Technical and Vocational Education and Training Colleges.

I strongly feel that had student representatives and their constituency made time to genuinely engage the statement and reflect on what government is offering as an intervention, none of these protests would be taking place.

Inquiry The Presidential Commission of inquiry into higher education and training funding, which includes universities, and Technical and Vocational Education and Training Colleges has been established. This and the substantial increases in funding to the National Student Financial Aid Scheme since 2010 should be a demonstration to students how committed and seriously government takes free post-school education for the poor and working class as called for by the Constitution. The Presidential Commission is to advise on systemic and long-term measures to achieve a far-reaching reconstitution of the entire postschool education and training funding system, thereby enabling South Africans to access higher education.

We need to allow this commission to complete its work, please.

The following is worth quoting from the Minister's statement on student funding.

"We have looked at the challenges at hand from all sides and have concluded that the best approach would be to allow universities individually to determine the level of increase that their institutions will require to ensure that they continue to operate effectively and at least maintain existing quality – with the caution that this has to also take into account affordability to students, and therefore has to be transparent, reasonable and related to inflation-linked adjustments. Our recommendation is that the fee adjustment should not go above 8 percent".

Inflation

The latter is what the minister said as he went through his statement and probably what students chose to listen to and ignored the rest of what was said. What students seem to have missed immediately after the above paragraph is the following:

"To ensure that such inflation-linked fee adjustment on the 2015 fee baseline are affordable to financially needy student, government is committed to finding the resources to support children of all poor, working and middle class families – those with a household income of up to R600 000 per annum - with subsidy funding to cover the gap between the 2015 fee and the adjusted 2017 fee at their institution. This will be done for fee increments up to 8 percent.

This will in effect mean that all National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) qualifying students, as well as the so-called missing middle, that is, students whose families earn above the NSFAS threshold but who are unable to support their children to access higher education, will experience no fee increases in 2017", said the Minister. It really does not get any easier than this to understand this intervention by government.

Immediately after this the main question, particularly by different media houses, was but where will the money come from? Following this question the Finance Ministry issued a statement concurring with Minister Nzimande's statement and affirming that indeed government is sourcing money to make up for this shortfall in 2017.

We cannot take away the fact that this deci-

sion by government is a huge relief to parents and particularly to the same students who are currently up in arms protesting at different universities.

It is quite critical though that these students must realise that should they blindly continue protesting in this manner, they are not only delaying their future but protesting on behalf of those students whose families have got all the means to afford higher education.

Our country is highly economically skewed and this intervention by government is mainly for students from poor, working and middle class families. Wealthy families must under the circumstances continue paying fees for their children.

The Student Representative Council at each and every university in the country should really make time to genuinely engage the document together with their constituency.

Only if this is done genuinely, and I mean genuinely, our students will realise the massive intervention government is making in this matter.

Situation

We really cannot continue like this. We cannot have a situation where there is no order at all at our institutions of higher learning irrespective of mechanisms government continues putting in place to deal with the challenges.

EFFECTS OF TEAM BUILDING ON ORGANISATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

here is no organisation without people managing it, but the differences in these people are what make it a challenge for any manager.

He or she must build one team through the establishment of a common form of culture. By definition, Fapohunda (2013) understands team work from the 'team' and 'work' perspective because he understands that the teamwork is made of two words that were equally important for the betterment of the entire organisation. He however, defines a team as a group of people working towards a common goal and that team building involves the processes of enabling the group of people to reach their goals.

This notion must be made clear in the understanding that team building consists of steps like clarification of team goals; identification of hindrances to goal achievements; facing the identified challenges and enabling the achievement of the goals. Fajana (2002) asserts that teamwork is an integration of resources and inputs working in harmony to achieve organisational goals, where roles are prescribed for every organisation member, challenges are equally faced and incremental improvements are sought continually.

Importance of team work

From the researcher perspective, Fapohunda (2013) argues that team building demands a mastery of art by the manager in the sense it involves a wide range of activities, designed for improving team performance. Its aim is to bring out the best in a team to ensure self development, positive communication, leadership skills and the ability to work closely together as a team to problem solve. The idea behind this notion is performance improvement. Irfan and Lodhi (2015) averts that Teamwork is an effective and productive element in an organisation because it plays the vital role for the development of employees' performance as well as organisation betterment.

Inspiration

Inspiration can be defined as some form of brain washing in which one person creates a certain mindset for his or colleagues. In this case a team player identifies what needs to be done to have things done at the right time and in a right way. He or she then comes up with positive elements that would add fire to the people were to achieve it. Jason Kidd, one of the most common and well known team builder once crafted these words for his team: "We're going to turn this team around 360 degrees." The understanding is that once the team understands

what can be termed as the language of the team, then building that group of people can eventually inspire and motivate your team to work together and complete tasks efficiently. The team leader can also identify influential people in the society and invite them to add value to the team because being motivated by famous business leaders, historical figures, or even professional sports players can spark the fire that is needed to get the job done.

As a process

Another common figure in the field of understanding team building and what it can do to establish a successful organisation is Henry Ford, the founder of Ford Motors. He said "Coming together is a beginning. Keeping together is progress. Working together is success." Ford is today known as a man who revolutionised American industry and laid the foundation for many operating practices of today: his innovative thinking gave way to mass production and mass consumption where workers could purchase. In most cases, managers do on see the importance of secret in their businesses or organisations, they think workers

must be used and not developed and yet the opposite is the truth. In fact real and successful organisations are though with a stable employee turnover.

Stages of team development

Fapohunda (2013) argues that there are certain stages that a manager can take into consideration in the process of team building as proposed by Tuckman (1975) in a revision of the four stage model he first proposed in 1965. The first stage of team building is the forming which is the stage at which a group of people come together to accomplish a shared purpose. Next is the storming stage which involves disagreements about mission, vision, and approaches and team members getting to know each other. This stage can be characterised by strained relationships and conflicts. This is because individuals have different values and perceptions about things; hence it is the duty of the team builder to level the grounds among his or her members. This is followed by the norming stage where the team has consciously or unconsciously formed working relationships that are enabling progress on the team's objectives.

The fourth is the *performing* stage in which relationships, team processes, and the team's effectiveness in working on its objectives are synching to bring about a successfully functioning team. The final stage is the *transforming* stage where the team is performing so well that members believe it is the most successful team they have experienced; or the ending stage where the team has completed its mission or purpose and it is time for team members to pursue other goals or projects.

It must be noted however that not every team moves through these stages in the stated order. Again, various activities such as addition of new team members can send a team back to earlier stages. The experience of the members, the support the team receives and the knowledge and skills of the team members are factors that determine the length of time necessary for progressing through these stages.



UESTION: Will a female dog aborts if she is vaccinated or if she is mated with a male dog which has been vaccinated?

ANSWER: NO! There is absolutely no truth in this belief. However, she may abort if she has a contagious disease.

QUESTION: Should dogs be vaccinated under one year old?

ANSWER: YES! Dogs can catch and die of diseases from a very young age. The only way to protect them is by regular vaccinations, starting at 6-8 weeks for both cats and dogs.

QUESTION: If my dog is vaccinated will it lose speed and not be able to race?

ANSWER: NO! Vaccination will have no effect whatsoever on your dog's performance. However, the dog will certainly lose speed when it catches one of the many contagious diseases that can be prevented by vaccination.

QUESTION: Has my dog been poisoned?

ANSWER: A qualified veterinarian can quickly determine if the dog has been poi-

soned or if it is suffering from a disease. Sadly, many owners' mistake disease symptoms for poisoning and many dogs die unnecessarily simply because they were not vaccinated.

Why vaccinate?

Dogs and cats are subject to a wide variety of contagious and non-contagious diseases (to name just a few - Dogs: rabies, distemper, viral hepatitis, leptospirosis, parvovirus, parinfluenza (the latter five are covered in the 5in1 vaccination), coronavirus, kennel cough, giardia; Cats: rabies, feline viral rhinotracheitis, feline calicivirus, and panleukopenia - also known as feline distemper - (the latter three are covered in the 3in1 vaccination), cat flu and colds, viral enteritis, feline leukemia virus, chlamydia, feline infectious peritonitis) many of which can be prevented by vaccination.

Parvo virus can survive in the soil for several months, so bringing in a new puppy after parvo deaths will cause more deaths. Because humans and pets now live in greater concentrations than ever before, diseases spread far and fast. Yet with only a small effort and expense (rabies is free at the state vet) by owners, working dogs and pets can live long, happy and healthy lives.

An annual trip to the vet is beneficial in other ways. An annual check-up is one of the keys to keeping your dog or cat healthy and is an excellent preventive measure for

early problem detection. Treatment of the disease is more expensive than vaccination. The vet will check eyes and nose, mouth and teeth, ears, heart and lungs, fur, paws, anal glands and internal organs, feeling for signs of abnormalities such as swellings or lumps. Having a safe way to transport your pet to the vet and making your pet familiar with the routine is also important in case of emergency.

Keep your pet's veterinary certificate in a safe place. Make a diary note and take your dogs and cats to the vet when their vaccinations are due. Many conscientious owners have lost pets to rabies simply because they forgot to vaccinate. If you are not prepared to vaccinate, don't keep a pet, you are risking lives. Rabies is incurable and fatal to humans.

ecently, there have been a number of incidents and accidents that have reportedly happened at the work place.

These differ in veracity from minor scratches to some even resulting in the loss of life. Every organisation whether in mechanised production plants or consultancies dealing with office work should have a health and safety policy. As a responsible organisation, one of your priorities should be ensuring the safety of your employees.

From the title of the article, one might get the idea that the concern relates only to the health and safety of employees whilst in essence the objective should be keeping everyone at the workplace safe. Workplace health and safety practices and procedures are necessary for the well-being of employers, employees and visitors.

Prevention of workplace accidents and injuries is the aim of an effective occupational health and safety (OH&S) programme. Having a safe work environment where prevention is the key to an organisation's success is important to all workplace parties. When all workplace parties work co-operatively toincorporate safe work practices and procedures into their daily work activities, the savings inhuman and financial costs are immeasur-

Your employees expect you to provide a safe work environment. Unsafe working conditions lower both productivity and morale. As an employer, you must take 'all practicable steps' to ensure the safety of your employees while they are at work. This includes your workplace plus any other sites, such as building, farming or forestry sites, where they do work for you. Taking 'all practicable steps' means thinking about the ways that someone could be harmed and doing what is reasonably practicable to ensure the safety of that person.

Doing what is 'reasonable' means approaching health and safety in a rational and cautious manner, taking into account how seriously someone could be harmed, how likely it is, how you could prevent it and what safeguards are available. You should also understand industry specific hazards that may affect your workplace.

Employers are required to include a system for the recognition, evaluation, and control of hazards in their OH&S programme. Currently the most comprehensive framework that pro-

vides the practical steps to ensure workplace safety is the Swaziland National Standard SZNS OHSAS 18001:2007 Occupational Health and Safety Management System.

Developing and maintaining an effective OH&S program is a shared responsibility of all workplace parties based on their level of authority in the workplace. Hazards exist in all workplaces. The ability to adequately recognise, evaluate and control hazards can have a major impact on preventing injuries, illness and property damage in the workplace.

To adequately address issues of safety at work, the organisation is expected to:

- Provide a safe working environment and facilities, such as first aid kits and protective equipment, for staff safety and health.
- Ensure any plant or equipment they use is designed and made safe for the employee to use and is properly maintained.
- Develop emergency procedures.
- Develop a system to identify new and existing hazards then eliminate, isolate, or minimise significant hazards.
- Record the details of any incidents or acci-

dents and investigate to determine what needs to be done to prevent it happening again.

- Report any serious harm incidents to the Department of Labour.
- Involve your employees in developing ways to improve health and safety.
- Ensure that employees are aware of hazards that may affect them in the work they do and the controls that are in place to prevent harm.
- Make sure that all employees are adequately trained in safe operating procedures and supervised as they learn.
- Keep a first aid kit in each place where people are working. Kits should be a sufficient size to cope with the number of people needing to use it.

BENEFITS

Ensuring occupational safety and health is good for business as well as being a legal and social obligation. Swazi companies should appreciate that standards for occupational health and safety help to prevent people from being harmed or made ill through work and that it is also an essential part of a successful business.

The occupational health and safety standard and other related standards are available at SWASA. The authority also provides guidance through training on understanding and implementing the requirements of the standard. Organisations can also get certified by SWASA upon successful implementation of the standard



How to store

Store unripe pears in paper bag at room temperature. Refrigerate ripe pears.

Eating pears

Pears contain lot of nutrition such as vitamins and mineral that made this fruit has benefits for human health. Pears are consumed directly, canned, made juice, or dried. Pears can also be made in the form of jelly or jam, usually mixed with other fruits. Pears are rich in natural fiber which helps

the digestive process in our bodies, in addition, pears are also rich in vitamin C. The content of potassium, calcium, vitamin A, sugar and protein that exists in a pear is very good for the health of our bodies.

Therefore, it is advisable consuming this fruit for our health.

Pears are less allergenic than many other fruits, and pear juice is therefore sometimes used as the first juice introduced to infants. However, caution is recommended for all fruit juice consumption by infants, as studies have suggested a link between excessive fruit juice consumption and reduced nutrient intake, as well as a tendency towards obesity

Fresh pears are your healthiest choice, but canned pears can also be beneficial to your health. If you eat canned pears, choose versions packed in 100 percent fruit juice rather than syrup because they contain no added sugar. Chop a pear into bite-sized pieces and add it to a fruit salad, or stir the pieces into a carton of low-fat yogurt. Replace the jelly in your peanut butter sandwich with thin slices of pear, or add pear slices to a tossed green salad. Cut a pear into quarters and brush it with a small amount of butter. Sprinkle the pear with cinnamon and nutmeg and broil it until it's soft for a tasty and nutritious dessert.

A Few Words of Caution: There are no known interactions or health risks with pears, although there are always ongoing studies. However, since some people suffer from allergic reactions based on certain types of fruit, monitor your body's behavior and reaction if you do not normally eat pears, and only eat an appropriate amount, no more than one pear per day.

Mobile networks Vodacom, MTN, Cell C, Neotel and Telkom moved to assure MPs they were working hard to find ways to reduce the cost of data, but said an improved spectrum would go far in helping reduce the high cost of communication.

Spectrum refers to all wireless signals,

which include television, radio, GPS and mobile broadband. Hennie Jacobs, head of regulatory affairs at Vodacom, said the reason data costs in South Africa were so high was because of the "spectrum crunch" in large

urban areas. He said that there would be no progress on this front until the spectrum was improved. But EFF MP Fana Mokoena accused the cellphone operators of misleading consumers.

"What Vodacom is not taking into account is people are complaining not just about tariffs, but are given data that gets finished quickly. "I'm speaking from personal experience," said Mokoena.

adio personalities Thabo "Tbo Touch" Molefe and business partner Gareth Cliff have taken their fight against high data costs to parliament, where they pleaded with MPs to support their call,

Molefe described current data pricing as "daylight robbery" and wants network companies to be held accountable for the high cost of data in South Africa.

Molefe was speaking this week during public hearings held by the telecommunications and postal services portfolio committee on the high cost of communicating in the

Molefe set Twitter abuzz last week with

his #datamustfall campaign.

Molefe and Cliff said high data costs were inhibiting the growth of their business ven-

"It's an honour for this house to recognise our cause. These are some of challenges that SMMEs are faced with.

"This is also to voice the cries of students out there. Data is as essential as food, shelter and clothing," said Molefe.

University of the Western Cape SRC president Lukhanyiso Matebese said high data costs prevented students from conducting proper research for their studies.

"Your whole life as a student at UWC, if



you do not have data it comes to a standstill. With the rape culture it's not safe to access the library at night," said Matebese.

Joe Mjwara, acting director-general of the telecommunications and postal services

department, said cell-phone companies charged less for voice calls and text messages and charged more for data to "maintain profit margins".

'ANC must find way to stop corruption'

OHANNESBURG - The ANC needs to find a new way to tackle South Africa's problems, particularly corruption, says party veteran Winnie Madikizela-Mandela.

"We cannot pretend that we do not have problems and we cannot pretend that things are not wrong in our country. A lot of things are wrong," she told journalists.

"The kind of introspection we need would need a whole layer of fresh leadership, combined with the elders who are still left in the organisation, to revisit the question of the Freedom Charter, what has happened since 1994, and find out where we went so wrong." Among other issues, such as questioning the system of proportional representation, Madikizela-Mandela said: "The one word on everybody's lips is 'corruption'."

She said the ruling party's leadership should consider going on a retreat for a month to find some answers.

Commenting on the #FeesMustFall crisis, Madikizela-Mandela said: "We feel very sorry for the students. It is a very difficult problem.

"From lack of experience we have done things that were not really according to the Freedom Charter. "I know the clause that 'the doors of learning should be open to all'.

"In 1955 [when the charter was adopted] all those things seemed possible [but] when we got into government from 1994 we realised that the free education we promised wasn't going to be easy." Madikizela-Mandela said the cabinet should find a solution that met students halfway.

SAA pilots' R697 million-a-year perks under fire

Johannesburg - Pilots get five-star accommodation and generous travel benefits, at a cost of R697 million a year for South African Airways, according to a report.

The Citizen reported yesterday that pilots are:

• accommodated in hotels of the highest global standards

• entitled to free family travel on a preferential basis to normal fee-paying passengers in business class.

Quoting an SAA insider, the report stated: "It gets worse. If a pilot gets divorced, the previous wife gets the benefits and the new

girlfriend gets the benefit at the same time."

Pilots are also entitled to 90 days sick leave, which may be extended to 180 days in a one-year rolling cycle, the Citizen said.

Management meanwhile, is enti-

Management, meanwhile, is entitled to 36 working days' sick leave in a three-year cycle.

SA Transport and Allied Workers' Union general secretary Zenzo Mahlangu said pilots are also entitled to take a two-year sabbatical while their jobs are guaranteed on their return, allowing them to work for another airline during that time.

This issue was also highlighted in

September last year, when SAA board chairperson Dudu Miyeni sent an internal memo to staff stating that salaries paid to SAA pilots were "exorbitant and unaffordable".

Myeni said SAA pilots were a "paltry" 12% of the carrier's total workforce in SA but accounted for more than 40% of the airline's salary bill.

Fat salaries for pilots is not unique to South Africa.

Bloomberg reported recently that with its aviation sector booming, China is throwing money at these highly skilled professionals.

GABON PRESIDENTIAL RIVALS SET TO FACE OFF IN COURT

IBREVILLE - Security forces fanned out in Gabon's capital on Thursday as the west African country remained on edge awaiting the constitutional court's decision to end its post-election crisis and the uncertainty over who will be the next president.

Lawyers for incumbent President Ali Bongo and his rival Jean Ping were to appear at the court's first hearing in Libreville on Thursday on the highly-disputed poll.

It is down to the wire as the expiry of a 15-day deadline for the Constitutional Court to resolve electoral disputes was yesterday, and the court was expected to announce its ruling later on the day or today.

The small nation of 1.8 million people has been traumatised by the violent protests that erupted after Bongo was declared the winner of the August 27 election

by a wafer-thin margin of less than 6 000 votes.

The opposition charged that the vote was fraudulent and on September 8, Ping, an internationally-respected diplomat who himself claimed victory, filed a legal challenge, demanding a recount.

"The [election] observers will present their report. Then the

lawyers from both sides will speak for around 10 minutes," Ping's lawyer Jean Remy Bantsantsa told AFP. Bongo's lawyer Francis Nkea was not immediately available for comment. In his legal challenge, Ping asked for a recount in Haut-Ogooue province, a stronghold of the Bongo family who have ruled Gabon since 1967. Ali Bongo


won more than 95% of votes there on a reported turnout of more than 99%.

Following the poll, EU election observers said there had been a "clear anomaly" in the final results from Haut-Ogooue.

With suspense hanging over the court's deliberations, security forces in anti-riot gear were deployed around the capital Libreville on Thursday preparing to head off any more unrest should the judges decide against Ping.

Gabonese ministers, who have vowed to maintain order, warned the 73-year-old former head of the African Union Commission that his actions could be held responsible if new violent protests break out.

Ping's supporters say "more than 50" people were killed in the wave of post-electoral violence, but the interior ministry says the toll is three dead. *AFP*

BUJA - Nigeria's president said on Thursday he would be open to UN bodies coming in to act as intermediaries in any talks with Boko Haram Islamist militants on the release of about 200 kidnapped schoolgirls.

Muhammadu Buhari has vowed to free the girls, whose abduction almost two and a half years ago from the northeastern village of Chibok triggered international campaigns and piled pressure on his predecessor Goodluck Jonathan.
Nigeria would "welcome
intermediaries such as UN outfits, to step in", Buhari told UN
Secretary General Ban Kimoon on sidelines of the annual UN General Assembly in

New York, a statement issued

by the president's office said.
Buhari last year said for the first time his government was ready to negotiate over the girls. In August he said he would let the Islamist militant group choose a non-profit

organisation as an intermediary but the group has not commented on the proposal.

Any negotiations would be the first publicly known talks between the government and Boko Haram, whose sevenyear insurgency to create an Islamic state in the northeast has killed 15 000 people and displaced more than two million. "The challenge is in getting credible and bona fide leadership of Boko Haram to discuss with," said Buhari. AP

Morocco detains four 'dangerous' IS suspects

RhAT - Moroccan police have arrested four "dangerous" suspected jihadists linked to the Islamic State group who were planning attacks across the country, the government said on Thursday.

Investigators apprehended an individual on Wednesday in the northern city of Meknes who had been "planning terrorist attacks in Morocco," according to a statement from the interior ministry.

The suspect had "acquired vast experience in the manufacture of remotedetonated explosives" and was "about to procure essential materials to make a bomb", it added.

Last week, three suspected extremists were arrested around Tangiers, in northern Morocco, reportedly in the process of preparing "extremely serious terrorist acts," the statement said.

The head of the cell had allegedly been contacted by a Moroccan IS member and had planned to travel to join the jihadists in Iraq or Syria.

Rabat says more than 150 "terrorist cells" have been uncovered since 2002, including dozens in the past three years with ties to jihadists in Iraq and Syria.

A study by the US-based Soufan Group said last December that at least 1 200 Moroccans had travelled to fight alongside IS in Iraq and Syria in the previous 18 months. *AFP*

CLASH OF TITANS: CLINTON, TRUMP GIRD FOR FIRST DEBATE

Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton square off on Monday for their first presidential debate, a hotly anticipated cage match between a political veteran and an inveterate showman that seems likely to smash []Stelevision records.

The 90-minute, primetime debate pits the two White House contenders - ideological opposites on most issues and separated by just a handful of points in most opinion polls - in a duel that could help sway the November 8 election.

Tens of millions of Americans are expected to tune in to the debate, held at Hofstra University outside New York City, dissecting the candidates' every word. Experts say any slip of the tongue, even an errant look or gesture, could affect the opinion of legions of voters.

Some analysts say the bar is higher for the Democrat Clinton,

who has decades of experience inside Washington's corridors of power as an ex-secretary of state and former US senator - but struggles to ignite enthusiasm, even in her own camp.

The Republican Trump's biggest selling point is his status as a Washington outsider, a busi-

ness mogul and reality television star with a knack for the snappy sound-bite - who few expect to master the nitty gritty of policy.

Clinton has prepared meticulously for the coming clash, carefully studying Trump's primary debate performances, and even consulting psychologists to get a better read on her Republican rival's vulnerabilities, according to one news report.

Complicating her task is that Trump has taken opposite sides of numerous policy positions. He also has a mercurial personality that can vacillate between mellow and combative.

"I do not know which Donald Trump will show up," Clinton, 68, told supporters at a recent fundraiser.

"Maybe he will try to be presidential and try to convey a gravity that he hasn't done before, or will he come in and try to insult and score some points."

Going toe-to-toe against Trump means the wonkish former first lady may have to toss aside her briefing books and don her boxing gloves.

"Her supporters... they want to see her fight this guy," Wendy Schiller, a political scientist at Brown University, told AFP.

Michelle passport scan appears online

WASHINGTON - The White House said on Thursday it was looking into a cyber breach after what appeared to be a scan of First Lady Michelle Obama's passport being posted online. The fresh disclosures, which included emails to and from White House staffers, raised further concerns about the security of sensitive systems following a string of breaches affecting government agencies, private companies and the Democratic National Committee. Though officials declined to say whether the disclosures were authentic, there were no immediate reasons to suspect they were not. Attorney General Loretta Lynch said it was "something we are looking into".

Cops arrested for helping migrants

LILLE - Two Belgian policemen were arrested for helping a group of migrants return to France after they wound up in Belgium by mistake while heading to Calais, officials said Thursday. French Interior Minister Bernard Cazeneuve summoned Belgium's Ambassador to France, Vincent Mertens de Wilmars, to "ask for an explanation (and) express his displeasure," the ministry said. The Belgian officers were arrested by their French counterparts in the border town of Nieppe late Tuesday after they brought the 13 Iraqi and Afghan migrants across the frontier. AFP

Israel increases interrogations of travellers

JERUSALEM - For the past four years, Gaza hairdresser Safa al-Masri has obtained a travel permit from Israel to visit her relatives in the West Bank. But this year, when she applied for a permit to attend her sister's wedding, she received a different answer: Come in for questioning by Israeli security agents or be barred from travelling. Al-Masri is among a growing number of people who have been ordered to submit to Israeli interrogations in order to receive a coveted travel permit to exit the blockaded Gaza Strip.

National Guard in Charlotte to prevent clashes

CHARLOTTE - Hundreds of National Guard troops and police reinforcements converged on Charlotte Thursday, mobilised to prevent a third night of violent protests over the fatal police shooting of a black man. The tense southern city was under a state of emergency amid growing complaints that the authorities were slow to respond to crowds protesting the death of Keith Lamont Scott. *AFP*

Brazilian police arrest former finance minister

AO PAULO - Brazilian police arrested former Finance Minister Guido Mantega on Thursday as a sweeping corruption investigation further stuck at the heart of the Workers Party (PT) that ran the country for 13 years. Police investigators told a news conference they took Mantega, a long time confidant of recently impeached former President Dilma Rousseff and an early member of the PT, into custody at the Albert Einstein Hospital in Sao Paulo. He was there accompanying his wife as she prepared for surgery.

Quoting witness testimony, they said Mantega in 2012 had requested a payment of five million reais, or about \$2.5 million (R34.77 million) at the time, to benefit the PT. Brazil's longest-serving finance minister of the past 70 years, Mantega in 2012 was also the chairman of Petroleo Brasiliero, or Petrobras, the state-run oil company at the centre of a sprawling political kickback scheme.

A few hours after his arrest, federal judge Sergio Moro ordered Mantega released from custody, which he was at about 2 pm local time after being detained for eight hours.

Moro ruled that Mantega's cooperation with authorities, the fact they had already searched his home, and that he was supporting his wife as she fights cancer all indicated the former minister was unlikely to be a threat to interfere with the investigation. *Reuters*

AVANA - Japan's Prime Minister Shinzo Abe became the first Japanese leader to visit Communist-ruled Cuba on Thursday, landing in Havana to hold talks with Cuban President Raul Castro on topics from boosting trade to curbing North Korea's nuclear programme.

Abe's visit to the Caribbean island is one of a slew by

western leaders since it began normalising ties with the United States nearly two years ago. US President Barack Obama visited Cuba in March.

In an interview published in Cuba's Communist Party newspaper Granma on Thursday, Abe said he wanted to discuss trade, investment, cooperating on development and strengthening tourism exchange.

"I also want to exchange opinions with a Cuba that holds great influence among the non-aligned countries about the reform of the United Nations Security Council, nuclear disarmament, the situation in Asia and other topics involving the international community," he was quoted as saying.



Barca begin road trip without Messi

ARCELONA - A Barcelona side missing injured Lionel Messi face Sporting Gijon in the first of three away games in a week, as they battle to keep pace with La Liga leaders Real Madrid today. Messi suffered the recurrence of a oroin strain in Wednesday's 1-1 draw with Atletico Madrid that will keep the five-time World Player of the year sidelined for the next three weeks. His absence could have a bigger impact on Argentina than Barca because the two-time world champions will be without their captain for World Cup qualifiers against Paraguay and Peru.

However, Spanish champions Barca have three tricky obstacles to overcome in the next week as they head also to Borussia Moenchengladbach in the Champions League on Wednesday before another away trip to Celta Vigo next Sunday.

"We all wish that he was with us.
The team is stronger with him than without him, but these unexpected situations happen," Barca captain Andres Iniesta said on Thursday.
"Squads win titles.

Individuals help, but it is the squad as a whole that wins things." Without Messi, Barca's other two star for-

wards Luis Suarez and Neymar will be expected to take on extra responsibility – just as they did in scoring 16 goals in the six league games Messi missed during a two-month injury layoff last season.

Sergio Busquets also came off early against Atletico due to the aftereffects of a fever, but should be fit to start in Asturias.

Arda Turan is the favourite to

replace Messi after deputising ably on the other side of the Barca frontline when Neymar was absent at the start of the season because of his participation in the Rio Olympics. One familiar face to Barca may not be available for Sporting due to a comical injury — on-loan Brazilian full-back Douglas injured his hip when sleeping on the team bus back from a 2-1 defeat to Celta Vigo on Wednesday. © *AFP*

explained the decision: "AB
has been on a rigorous rehabilitation and treatment plan for the

last six weeks but is still complaining of pain in the elbow region. We consulted with a specialist, who advised extensive rehab and injected the elbow with cortisone, however, the CSA medical committee has recommended a few more days of rehab to allow the elbow to improve.

He will undergo treatment this week with our physiotherapist, Brandon Jackson, and a final call on his availability for the first ODI against Australia will be subject to him passing a fitness test. While surgery remains the last option, we hope that the extra time will allow the injury to respond to treatment." Faf du Plessis will captain the team in the one-off match against Ireland, and Rilee Rossouw has been added to the squad as batting cover in De Villiers' absence.






