

ASIANS FIGHT SPARKED BY LADY – AKBER CLAIMS IN COURT PAPERS

THE Asian who was attacked and left for death by his fellow countrymen, was hacked with his own bush knife, it has been alleged.

Naeem Gul was allegedly hacked by a group of his countrymen after a scuffle near Ntamakuphila at Siteki on April 19, 2016. He was severely injured and left with gaping wounds on the head, leg and shoulder after he was attacked by four businessmen of Asian origin.

Four Pakistan nationals were arrested by Siteki police and were charged with attempted murder as well as malicious damage to property for allegedly causing E22 000 loss after smashing Gul's motor vehicle.

Akber Ali Pak (44), Zafar Iqbal Pak (23), Ehsan Ahmed Pak (21) and Wasim Ranhi Pak (36) were arrested by the police on the same day of the incident.

They are currently kept at the Big Bend Correctional facility. They have since instructed Mabila Attorneys to file bail applications before the High Court.

In his affidavit, Akber Ali Pak alleged that the bone of contention was that Gul had threatened to deal with and accused him of raising the middle finger at him. He has denied ever raising a middle finger at Gul, but was merely greeting a lady who was standing next to Gul by raising his hand.

He claimed that he was driving past Gul's shop at Mpolonjeni and waved to a lady who was standing by the bus stop.

"The complainant assumed that I was raising my middle finger at him and took a stone and threw it at my car, damaging the window thereof. I

got so angry and called my friend who arrived to calm the situation down. He arrived in the company of my co-accused. The situation was calmed down and we left," Akber Ali Pak said.

He claimed that a short while thereafter, he received a call from an anonymous person threatening to deal with him as he had escaped narrowly. Akber alleged that he assumed that it was Gul who had made the call because they had just engaged in a scuffle.

He alleged that in the evening he visited a friend at Ntamakuphila with the co-accused and found Gul who was at a friend's shop.

He claimed that Gul charged at him armed with a bush knife and he was joined by his friend in attacking him. His co-accused reportedly joined in

the fight, but Gul's friend retreated after he noticed that they were being over powered.

Akber alleged that Gul was injured while he and the coaccused were defending themselves against him and in the process his motor vehicle got smashed as well.

He submitted that the matter was urgent because he has three children and a wife and did not have any support while he was behind bars and that he was a Muslim.

"I am a Muslim by religion and require a special diet which cannot be provided in prison and as such I have problems with the food served there," he said.

He was represented by lawyer Charles Jele before High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze yesterday and the matter was postponed to Friday after the director of public prosecutions office indicated that it was opposing the application.

Only wholesaler closed as owner remains in custody

RETAILERS in Siteki and surrounding areas are stranded after Mpumalanga Wholesaler and Supermarket indefinitely closed doors last week.

The wholesaler is the only one that operates within the town centre where most retailers get their stock for resale from.

It is owned by Akber Ali Pak who is currently kept in custody after he was arrested together with three others namely; Zafar Iqbal, Ehsan Ahmed and Wasim Ranjhi last week

They are facing a charge of attempted murder and malicious damage to property as it is alleged that they attacked and assaulted one Naeem Gul Khan.

Since the day of their arrest last Tuesday, the wholesaler has been closed, resulting to some retailers also running out of stock.

Frustration

A number of business people have voiced their frustration, which has come with the indefinite closer of the shop. It has been gathered that some retailers now travel all the way to Manzini to get stock for their shops

Some business people were yesterday found near the wholesaler as they were not aware that it has been closed since last week.

One business lady, Nomsa Mamba, who was also found at the entrance point of the wholesaler, disclosed that she normally comes to buy stock from the wholesaler on a weekly basis.

Mamba operates a grocery shop at Ngcina.

Aware

"I was not aware that the shop is closed, and right now I have to return home," said Mamba. Others stated that for some time, they thought that the wholesaler was closed for a moment as a norm with businesses owned by Asians who would temporarily close while attending church services.

Meanwhile, the four men of Pakistani nationality are expected back in court tomorrow for further orders from the public prosecutions. Their case is mostly likely to be tried at the High Court as is the norm with cases of attempted murder and other serious crimes.

...Akber has E10 million stock

PAKISTANI national and Siteki businessman Akber Ali Pak has property worth E10 million in the country.

He has made the allegation in his affidavit filed before the High Court where he applied to be admitted to bail.

He submitted that there was no likelihood that he will escape trial if granted his liberty. He also submitted that he would not endanger the safety of the public because he was a businessman who operated three businesses.

He claimed that among his three businesses was a wholesale shop which has about E10 million stock.

He also claimed that he employed 25 people in his business and they were currently redundant because his shops were locked when he was arrested and this negatively affected his employees.

He also submitted that he would not interfere with potential crown witnesses because he had still not been given a summary of evidence, therefore he did not know who they were.

"There are no exceptional circumstances which may suggest there is likelihood that my release on bail may disturb the public order or undermine the public peace or security as I am a law abiding citizen who pays allegiance to the authorities and state. I am a Swazi citizen by registration and am firmly rooted in the Kingdom of Swaziland," he said.

Long awaited FESWATU to be launched Sunday

THE long awaited Federation of Swaziland Trade Unions (FESWATU) will finally launch on Sunday at King Sobhuza II Memorial Stadium on Workers Day.

This was revealed by the federation's President and co-founder Mashumi Shongwe yesterday.

He said affiliates to FESWATU were unions from different industries such as the textile, manufacturing, forestry, agriculture and security.

Shongwe, one of the employees from Montigny Investments and also serving as Nhlangano Mayor, announced that they were now publicly announcing their existence after they were registered last year July after they followed all necessary requirements.

He said they were a new federation whose principles were far different from other organisations where some ended up being hijacked by 'jackals' whose ambitions were also questionable and failing to stick to the mandate.

"It is true, FESWATU is born and would be officially launched on May 1, which is the Workers Day. For us it is double celebrations as we are to be recognising the Workers' Day and also launching of the umbrella mother body of the unions from different sectors affiliated to us. It's going to be a big event and there is no doubt about that as we have lined up a number of activities," said Shongwe.

Preparations

He said preparations for the launch were already at an advanced stage.

"It's a national launching as our branches throughout the kingdom know about our existence. Having registered July last year after our return from the Geneva conference. FESWATU has a clear mandate and even the way we are going to operate, it is going to be according what is stated in our manifesto.

"We are a federation that hears all issues affecting the social partners without expecting the other party to be made a scapegoat on issues that could be handled harmoniously.

"In short and to be straight to the point, we believe in dialogue than the violent tactics preferred and applied by certain organisations claiming to be representing its members even when it's clear that they are straying and not sticking to what they were established for," said Shongwe.

He explained that they were not in anyway in a competition with any existing union or federation but theirs was to see the welfare of the workers addressed.

Employment

"Again, we would be working hard to have the Swazis who are not employed getting employment as a way of addressing poverty in the country and all this is in our manifesto," said Shongwe.

The president said FESWATU, would take into account all the views of the social partners and not the type of a federation or organisation which seemed to be only pushing agendas without even bothering to consult membership.

"We have a clear policy which is

NEWLY formed Federation of Swaziland Trade Union (FESWATU) authorities have made it clear that only members were expected to be part of the launch on May 1.

According to the federation's President Mashumi Shongwe, there would be screening done on the day to avoid a situation where people with ulterior motives could end up hijacking the ceremony for other purposes.

He said even the membership entrance to the stadium would

under the tripartite structure we operate under. We condemn any form of disrespect or belittling even those we consider our earthly leaders or fathers.

This is a federation which I strongly believe is to be the answer to all the challenges faced by the stakeholders and we believe resolving anything such as dispute in an amicable manner without violence or hatred created," said Shongwe.

He said it was his hope that after the launch, FESWATU's impact would

depend on whether members appeared in the registry as it was resolved that all the branches should forward the list before the actual day of the celebrations.

"We will have strict controls as we know what could happen if we decide to be lax and allowing anyone to be part of this big function. It's not just an open event for everyone as there could be regrettable consequences, including disruption of some sort when we plan the launch to be successful and peaceful.

240 PRISONERS FREED AFTER KING'S PARDON

Correctional Services to save over E1.1 million per year in costs

ABOUT 240 prisoners have been freed after receiving the King's pardon on Friday.

The number was confirmed by His Majesty's Correctional Services PRO Assistant Commissioner Bongani Khumalo yesterday.

He said the pardoned offenders were those who were left with four months or less of their sentences.

This move will see His Majesty's Correctional Services save up to E1 104 000 in 12 months from this good gesture by His Majesty.

The above figure is based from the fact that it costs the taxpayer E150 per day to keep a single inmate in jail.

The cost of each offender per week is E1 050 and that multiplied by 52 weeks totals to E54 600.

Offenders

When multiplied by the number of released offenders, it makes the E1.1 million per year.

Khumalo said the inmates were from various correctional centres in the country.

He said amongst those already released were 12 females whilst the 228 were males.

.. Mzuthini thanks King's good heart

HMCS Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase expressed his profound gratitude to His Majesty King Mswati III for pardoning the well behaved offenders serving time in the various correctional centres countrywide.

Through this gesture, Ntshangase said the King showed that he has a big heart for his people regardless of their circumstances including those in jail.

The commissioner general stated that the King granted pardon to all offenders save for those on special conditions (life sentence).

Offenders with a remaining sentence of 12 months or less had their sentences reduced by a third, while those with 13 or more months shall have such sentences reduced by six months only. The commissioner general also appealed to all released offenders and those to be released soon to express appreciation to the King by showing good behaviour and avoid committing mistakes which might lead them back in jail.

He also appealed to the nation to give support to the newly released inmates so that they can feel welcomed and appreciated by the community.

Ntshangase said the King's gesture served as a statement to the entire offender community that good behaviour pays.

He said it was upon them to keep behaving in a positive manner so as to earn the support of the country's authorities.

He explained that the King as the Commissioner-In-Chief of Correctional Services has great interest in the activities of the department as well as the promotion of offenders' welfare issues.

Operations

"His Majesty is part and parcel of the department's operations. To show this, he also pardoned offenders during last year's Correctional Services day held at Correctional Staff College in Matsapha," he explained.

Ntshangase further highlighted that the pardoning of the offenders helped in easing inmates' congestion in correctional centres as well as reducing prison administration costs because apart from food rations, the department spends a lot of resources through providing medical services to offenders, while other costs were incurred through utility bills like electricity and water.

12 years, no fine for inyanga that raped client

A 52-year-old inyanga has been sentenced to 12 years imprisonment without an option of a fine for raping his patient.

Jabulani Dlamini appeared before Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo yesterday for judgement on his rape charge.

Dlamini maintained his plea of not guilty up to the end of the trial. He stated that the reason he pleaded not guilty was because according to him they had an agreement with the accused who later changed tune saying he had raped her.

However, when the survivor gave her evidence, she stated that Dlamini lured her into his *indumba* (consulting room) stating that he would help her with herbs that would heal and also her get a job.

However, the traditional healer then turned against her and forced himself unto her.
Dlamini disputed that saying it was all lies.

He said he was not even an *inyanga* but earns a living through looking after cattle as he was a retired mineworker.

The principal magistrate, however, before passing judgment reminded the accused that he must remember that not only the survivor stated that he was a traditional healer but also another witness Nhlanhla Dlamini corroborated her saying the accused had a habit of selling concoctions to the public. The witness stated that at one point the accused even sold a mixture for sexual enhance-

ment to an officer employed at His Majesty's Correctional Service. But when asked to mitigate, the *inyanga* continued to plead not guilty.

He stated that to prove he did not force himself on the survivor, there was no call out for help by her and he never even threatened her with anything.

The accused stated that he later learned that the survivor's sister asked if he had given her any pocket money in exchange of the sexual activity the complainant offered to him.

Case

The survivor told her sister that she was not given anything. It is then that the survivor's sister told her that she must open a case of rape against Dlamini.

Dlamini stated that he was surprised when he saw community police showing up at his place to arrest him on grounds that he had raped the survivor.

Khumalo told the accused that the offence he committed was very serious, therefore he must mitigate and state why he should be given a lesser sentence

The principal magistrate said men often times took advantage of women's physical weakness. Khumalo also noted that the accused did not even use protection when he committed the offence thus exposing the complainant to sexually transmitted infections.

He stated that rape was not only an assault but it carries some form of stigma to the survivor.

After mitigating, the accused was then sentenced to 12 years imprisonment without an option of a fine.

Two convicts abandon appeal after King's pardon

TWO convicts have abandoned a review against Magistrate Simangele Mbatha's six months sentence without an option to pay a fine after His Majesty the King's pardon.

The King last Friday pardoned all well behaved inmates who had four months or less remaining in their sentences.

Thulani Magagula and Sikhumbuzo Dlamini were part of the lucky 240 who went home after the King's kind gesture exercised after consultation with the Prerogative of Mercy Committee.

The two had been charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm for assaulting Duma Mahlobo and stabbing him with a



knife on March 15, 2016 at Mvembili in the Hhohho region.

They pleaded guilty to the charge and were convicted. They were then sentenced to six months imprisonment without the option to pay a fine by the Pigg's Peak based magistrate and subsequently filed an appeal.

They instructed lawyer Sabelo 'Chicken' Dlamini from NMK Attorneys to file a review application before the High Court.

Their grounds of review were that

the learned magistrate never forwarded clear reasons why she meted out the sentence. They argued that the sentence was in contravention of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act in that she meted out a custodial sentence when the crown had not led oral evidence because they had admitted guilt.

They applied to have their sentences reviewed and set aside and in the meantime be admitted to bail pending review.

The matter was later abandoned when it appeared before Judge Mzwandile Fakudze at the High Court

Their attorney submitted that the matter had been overtaken by events because the two had already been released as a result of the King's pardon. The judge entered that as a ruling.



Moza man hacked to death at Mbhuleni

A well-known Mozambican man was found dead and covered in blood at the notorious Mbhuleni Township in Matsapha on Sunday night.

The man was found lying in the middle of a dusty road in the trouble-prone area by a man who stumbled on him as he lay facing down.

It is said even though the deceased, only identified as Andreas, was well known in the

Tommy Kirk wants to evict widow from farm

BUSINESSMAN Tommy Kirk's company wants to evict a widow from its farm to give way to a multi-million township at Malkerns. Kirk is the director of Diesel Services which allegedly owns farm 1270 of portion 56 in Manzini.

The company has filed an urgent application before the High Court seeking an order directing Margaret Shongwe, the alleged illegal squatter, to desist from constructing on the farm.

It has also applied for an order directing her to

forthwith demolish the structures she has already erected in the farm. If she fails to do so, the company has applied for an order to be authorised to demolish the structures with immediate effect.

In an affidavit, Kirk alleged that the place where the farm was located was declared an urban area by the Malkerns Town board and it attracted rates payable to the town board.

He alleged that Shongwe and her children continued to be in illegal occupation of the farm and erected illegal structures inside the farm.

He alleged that the Malkerns Town Board then warned his company to desist from erecting structures on the farm without being granted a permit. He claimed that the company had not been aware of the said construction going on in

He alleged that Shongwe continued to harvest and cut a forest inside the farm without lawful authority of his company.

"I submit that Diesel Services Ltd has not put up any building structure in contravention of the law, nor has it authorised anyone to do so on Farm 1270 portion 56," Kirk said.

He alleged that he got to know of the alleged illegal acts by Shongwe when he had gone to apply for a building permit to erect a multi million township to be known as Malkerns Township. He claimed that he was told to first put his house in order.

He said the matter was urgent because his company had already committed huge funds for the project.

"The applicant has committed a huge amount for the establishment of the town ship (400 plots) as it engaged contractors, hired heavy plant equipment, conducted a study with the help of engineers, environmentalists, board from human settlement and surveyors, whose study and design cost over E1 million. Therefore, it risks being sued by the contractors and its employees if the project does not take place any time soon," Kirk said.

The matter was yesterday heard by High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze and the parties agreed that Diesel Services would not demolish any of Shongwe's structures pending finalisation of the matter in court. The agreement was made an order of court.

The matter is pending before court.

W RATES BILLS OUT: PLEASE CHECK YOUR POST OFFICE

THE Municipal Council of Manzini has begun a new financial year and, as expected, new rates bills have already been posted in the post office.


If you own property in Manzini; be it an undeveloped plot or a house, please ensure that you visit the post office and get your rates statement.

Since the bills were released at the beginning of April 2016, the expectation is that by the end of June 2016 you should have settled the due amount; failing which an interest at 15% per annum will begin to trickle in. If, for some reason, you cannot afford to pay the entire billed amount as a once off transaction, you do have the option to pay the due amount in monthly instalments. That will mean that if the total amount due is E5000, you will divide that amount by the remaining number of months before March 2017 and pay in instalments.

All you need to do is fill-in the monthly commitment form which is available at Council's Treasury department on or before the 30th June 2016. In that way you will not be charged interest on your outstanding rates. However, if it so happens that you default on the monthly commitment the interest charges will certainly creep in.

Just in case, for some reason, you have not received your new rates bill please contact our City Treasurer and you shall be furnished with it. It's important that you know how much you are expected to pay this year so that you can start drawing a payment plan as soon as possible. If you do not have the time to drive or walk all the way to the Council Rates Hall for payment purposes you may opt for




an electronic funds transfer. The Treasury department will assist you with the bank details. Likewise, if you do not want to carry large sums of money to the Rates Hall please don't stress; just bring your debit or credit card and you will be able to pay your rates by swiping. For those who prefer payment by debit orders that option is also available.

News

The most exciting news is that Council has prepared 'thank you' gifts for all ratepayers who will come through and pay between today and the 30th June 2016. However, please note that the quantity is limited hence they will be given out on a first-come-first-served arrangement. Now, please pay your rates and claim your gift at the Rates Hall. The gifts have been categorized according to the amount paid. One may be asking themselves why it is so necessary to pay rates. The simplest

answer is that all property owners within the Manzini urban area are required by legislation to pay rates (property taxes) to Council. The rates money is used to provide service to the city. The level of service quality depends on whether or not all ratepayers pay their due rates in full. If Council receives 50% of the total due rates by the end of the financial year it only means that she also can only be able to provide 50% service. Likewise, if every property owner pays their rates in full, even the service delivered by Council will be at 100% in terms of quality. This means that there will be no one driving on potholes, the road reserves will be well maintained with no overgrowth, all the high mast lights will be fully functional, gravel roads will be well maintained, waste will be collected in a satisfactory manner and the city will develop in leaps and bounds.

Message of the WHO Regional Director for Africa,
Dr Matshidiso Moeti,
on the occasion of African Vaccination Week 2016.

From 24-30 April 2016, countries in the African Region will commemorate the 6th edition of the African Vaccination Week (AVW) with the theme: "Close the immunization gap. Stay polio free." The goal of AVW is to strengthen immunization programmes in the African Region by raising awareness on the importance of every person's need and right to be protected fron vaccine-preventable diseases. It aims to keep immunazation high on national and regional agendas through advocacy and partnerships. It also promotes delivery of other high-impact lifesaving interventions.

The theme for this year's commemoration - "Close the Immunization gap. Stay polio free." - draws attention to the need to attain universal immunization coverage in the African Region. It is also a celebration of the important polio eradication milestone that has been reached in the African Region, and a reminder that countries need to remain vigilant to ensure they stay polio free. Progress has been made in immunization in the Region over the last decade. Some of the key achievements include an increase of the coverage of the 3rd dose of Diphetheria Tetanus-Pertussis vaccine from 52% in 2000 to 77% in 2014, the decline in Measles deaths by 86% during the same period, and acceleration of the introduction of new vaccines.

Despite these achievements, one in five children still does not receive all the basic vaccines they need (Yellow fever. Measles, polio, etc). Progress in vaccination coverage in recent years has also stalled. This is due to the numerous challenges related to fragile health systems, family and community factors (supply chain, human resources, community demand...) that deter community participation, health emergencies of global and regional significance that compete for attaention and resources with routine immunization.

The commemoration of the sixth edition of the AVW occurs at an important juncture in the history of immunization in the African Region as it follows two important events that have taken place during the past six months: Nigeria's removal from the list of Polio endemic countries in September 2015, and the first ever Ministerial Conference on Immunization in Africa (MCIA) held in February 2016 in Addis Ababa, Ethopia where political leaders from the African continent reaffirmed their commitment to reach every child with the vaccines they need.

Over the past few years, the commemoration of AVW has provided a unique opportunity to implement a variety of activities ranging from advocacy and social mobilization to immunization and other related health activities.

As we commemorate the sixth edition of the AVW, I call on all countries and partners to sustain and strengthen the gains made in immunization coverage, carry forward the momentum from the Addis Ababa Ministerial Conference and stay accountable to the commitments made at the Conference, and close the immunization gap once and for all. I also urge countries to use the huge polio infrastructure acquired over the years across the Region to contribute towards broader immunization and health goals.

Abolish pre-primary fees - UNESCO children from poor families.

UNITED Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Swaziland together with eight Southern African countries are calling for the abolishment of Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) fees.

This transpired in two-day Southern African Regional Conference for ECCE being held at Happy Valley. It was revealed during the conference that many children do not have access to ECCE because it is expensive.

It was said though many developing countries offered free primary education they do not offer free ECCE, which pose as a disadvantage for children from poor families.

UNESCO Head of Education Unit Carol Medel-Anoneuvo said ECCE is very important since the human brain develop most rapidly in early childhood. She said ECCE improves readiness, learning, completion and education

"The quality of brain architecture is affected by early childhood experiences. ECCE nurtures physical and mental health of children and reduce late reliance on the health care system and special support," she said.

She further said challenges they face include uneven progress amongst the children. "Factors such as location of the child, wealth of the family of the child and the growing number of private school pose as a challenge. Pre-primary education is a need for all children regardless of the background.

In 2011, pre-primary enrolment in the region rose by almost two and half times on average, however only 20% of young people were enrolled in 2012. Children in rich households are more likely to attend the early learning programme," he said.

Medel-Anoneuvo further said international recommendation say pre-primary should be made compulsory. "At least one year of compulsory pre-primary education should be provided as part of basic education" She further said the goal is to ensure that by 2013 all girls and boys have access to quality of early child-hood development care and education and pre-primary education so that they are ready for primary education. She said this goal can be achieved recruiting, retaining and supporting qualified personnel for ECCE. "It is important to have ECCE teachers educated to ensure that quality is taught to the children who are at a critical stage," she said

Govt committed to quality education

MINISTER of Education and Training Dr. Phineas Magagula said the Swazi government has recognised the importance of ECCE, and thus has developed a policy and strategic instruments to provide a road map to quality education.

The ministry of education and training has developed the education sector strategic plan, the education sector policy and the national education improvement plan, all of which highlight the ministry's commitment to providing affordable quality ECCE programmes, and ensuring expanded access by all children.

The minister said expanding access to high quality early childhood education is among the smartest investment that one can make.

"Research show that during the early stage in a child's life, when the brain is forming, represent a critical window of opportunity to develop a child's' full potential and shape key academic, social, cognitive skills that determine a child's success in school and in life. It is a stage where most of the human brain is developed. Most of this is formed as a result of environmental exposure, such as nutrition and interaction with others."

Magagula further lamented that in low income countries, where education for all is still far from becoming a reality, the provision for early childhood education is still very limited and more often than not, organised on private basis and therefore only available to children from the wealthiest of families.

"There is flagrant inequality which is detri-

mental to those who are most disadvantaged. Swaziland is not different from these countries as she is experiencing low access to early education. The ministry has established that less than 40% of young children attend early child-hood education and most of the early child-hood education centres do not provide good quality services, consequently many children enter school unprepared.

High failure and drop-out rate in the primary school due to the children who enter school not well prepared. The non-conducive environment at ECCE centre that put children's live at risks such as injury and death," he said.

A brief history of the Mnisi tribe:

THE Mnisi are of Ntungwa-Nguni origin and their bloodline is from Ngwane.

The Ngwane or the Dhlamini group had gradually moved southward under pressure from Makalanga under Chief Tembe in the north-east (Delagoa Bay area) by the late 18th century. In the years that followed their settlement was at Shiselweni, along the northern banks of the Pongola River, the Ngwane came into frequent conflicts with other developing political units such as the Ndwandwe, the Mthethwa and, later, the Zulu. Shabalala, Dhlamini III's brother, had splintered from the Ngwane group at Shiselweni by the end of the 18th century.

He later settled with his followers a little further west of Shiselweni in the vicinity of the Mkhondvo River at eMhlongamvula (place of rain) in an area later known as Wakkerstroom in the Carolina district. (Madlangampisiberg). From 1817, mounting pressure from the Ndwandwe in the south pushed the remaining ruling Ngwane group, then under Sobhuza I, from Shiselweni further west and northwards to Ezulwini valley. With Swazi headquarters far away at Ezulwini in the north and after the death of Sobhuza I in 1836, the Shabalala, then under Ndawonde, began to act more independently of the fragile monarchy. Upon Ndawonde Shabalala's death, his two sons, Mandlangampisi and Sibankwa, became embroiled in a succession dispute. Mandlangampisi was trounced, but fled to Mswati II, Sobhuza I's successor, from about

1845, for military aid. Mswati II seized the opportunity and his formidable army routed Sibankwa's outnumbered men. Sibankwa was killed. Mswati II then installed Mandlangampisi as his subordinate chief.

The other sons of Shabalala from one of his wives are Maladla, the eldest, who had a younger brother by the name of Mnisi-the founder of the Mnisi clan. Their mother was from the Motsa clan, who are of Sotho origin (Motsa sounds like the Sotho name for someone who is clever or "clever one" or otherwise. Mnisi was raised up at his mother's home, the Motsa. The Motsa were rain makers as seen by their praise names:

Mnisi learned the ritual of rain making by watching at night, pretending to be asleep. he had mastered the whole ritual, he stole the rain medicines and fled. It is believed also that it was the rain drum that was stolen.

The Motsa discovered the theft too late. Maladla, Mnisi's brother, was not aware of the theft and went to the Motsa to ask them to make rain for him.

When Maladla discovered about the theft, he then approached his younger brother, Mnisi, who managed to make rain for him as he has seen it done by the Motsa. Then the Motsa attacked Maladla and Mnisi after the latter made rain for the former. The brothers fled. the Mdzimba mountain range at the homestead called Mhlangwane. Maladla was eventually killed by the Motsa when he went to visit them. Mnisi had many wives and children. Mnisi was famous for his rain making powers.


He catered for all our educational needs in some of the prominent schools. Despite being a fireman, our father managed to make us proud by taking us to these schools," said Sikhumbuzo.

A complainant is still in shock after suffering at the hands of the police and ended up not being taken seriously when he tried to open a case against the law enforcers.

Bhekisisia Manana opened a case against two police officers and a Mozambican national.

This was after police officers in Manzini at the bus rank handed

over a sjambok to a Mozambican national to thrash Manana in revenge while they watched.

Manana after suffering serious injuries went to hospital where he was treated and discharged.

He then went to a police station to open a case of assault, however, he was sent from pillar to post without getting any help.

Manana said he then suspected that the officers were protecting one of their own hence he took the matter to their superiors with the

hope that he might get help.

"I was told to be patient as police were still investigating the matter. I opened a case against the three officers because he I was shocked by their behaviour of letting someone take the law into his own hands with their permission," he said.

Manana said he has heard of people who lost their lives while inside police holding cells and even on that day he nearly became one of those victims.

He said the injuries he sustained on that day were so severe in such a way that he had to be bandaged and get treatment from a doctor and also do regular checkups.

When called for comments on

the incident, Deputy Police Information and Communications Officer Phindile Vilakati confirmed that such an incident was reported to the police and they were investigating it.

However, Manana was not happy with the way police handled his matter. He said he does

not understand what was being investigated because even the

"He got angry, rushed back to his room and pulled out a knife. One of my grandchildren alerted me to run to the nearest homestead as Tsabedze was carrying a knife. Out of fear I phoned the police because it was the second time in two months that the accused had threatened me with a knife," she narrated

When he appeared in court, Tsabedze claimed that he had no intentions of stabbing his grandmother and that he produced the knife to scare her.

The case was postponed to May 11, before Magistrate Simangele Mbatha.

The accused will remain in police custody until then.

TO CURB POACHING.

Big Game Parks works with RSP, prosecutors and game rangers

AFTER the fatal shooting of a poacher last week whereby a 16-year-old pupil, Delisa Mngometulu was killed by rangers while allegedly poaching at Mbuluzi Game Reserve, Big Game Parks is now working with the police, prosecutors and game rangers from Swaziland to curb the escalating crime of poaching.

Now dealing with poachers would take a whole different turn as police, prosecutors and game rangers are receiving training by the Endangered Species Protection Agency (ESPA) formed by British and American Special Forces.

According to the ESPA webpage the agency had an anti-poaching unit which is involved in the war against rhino poaching and other endangered wildlife species.

In an article from the Star newspaper it is stated that ESPA Spokesperson Martin Hewitt, a former officer of Her Majesty's

Third Battalion Parachute Regiment, told foreign media that Operation Alpha is working with Swaziland's Big Game Parks, offering three services which are:

physical train-

ing and management of crime scenes, operational support and investigation.

The publication was quoted stating that poaching is rife in Swaziland, and rangers are forced to shoot and kill poachers, with the recent fatal shooting of a poacher occurring last week where a 16-year-old pupil, Delisa Mngometulu was killed by rangers while allegedly poaching at Mbuluzi Game Reserve. Information gathered is that from early last year BGP put 51 rangers and 10 police officers from the Operational Support Services Unit through firearms handling and basic ranger-training courses. It is said the train-

ing which was well received by the Swazi Police and rangers is partly funded by Sporting Rifle through Save the Rhino.

Confidence

This training has given dence and operational competency they need to confront armed poaching gangs successfully.

It is said the second phase of the training will bring advanced prosecution skills for wildlife cases to a group of eight prosecutors from the Directorate of Public Prosecutions.

Reports also state that extra training is being done with the rangers to capacitate some of them as instructors.

The charity youth club worked in conjunction with various area tindvuna and local elders and headmen to best identify families that were in need of assistance.

"The club meets as Christians to donate some of their salaries even before a donation request arrives, then this money is then put into good use to help various families in need," said Dlamini.

Difficult

The four families of Jubukweni were of the late babe Mhlanga who passed away in November, 2008.

Jubukweni headsmen Sifiso Dlamini said Mhlanga left behind four widows and nine children and most of them were females who were finding it difficult to find jobs and 20 grandchildren divided amongst the four homesteads.

The high level of poverty was very clear for everyone to see as most of the children had no shoes or not enough clothes.

Most were minors under the age of nine who had to rely on elders so as to help them survive.

One of elders Thembeka Mhlanga (71) said they sometimes go for days without food.

"We the adults can go hungry, but the children need to eat more especially the little ones. They cry when they are hungry, and winter is coming we are stressed as to what the children will wear or eat. All the children have no shoes it is very hard for me and stressful," Mhlanga said.

Commended

Receiving the youth club on behalf of the Jubukweni constituency was Jubukweni Indvuna. Mbuso Sikhondze who commended the youth club on such a generous gesture.

"It is very heartwarming to see such young people being so thoughtful and caring and spending their time, thinking to help the less fortunate. I am amazed that the young people of Mbabane will come all the way to our constituency and help where they can, it is very impressive," he said.

The four families were identified by the indvuna and community elders as the people that needed help the most.

Vendor shares her business success


A Pigg's Peak market vendor attributes her 10-year success in business to red river clay (*libovu*).

Mary Cynthia Nxumalo has been a vendor in the Pigg's Peak market since 2006.

"Hard economic times forced a lot of people to think outside the box and come up with solutions. This is one of them, I now also sell red river clay or mud and it is making a good profit for me.

"The river clay has recently started gaining popularity with tourists and locals, I am able to support my two children with the profits I get from it. Each ball goes for E5 and on a good day I sell at least 10 balls," Nxumalo said.

She said people had various uses for it but it was usually used by traditional

"I just hope that my fellow vendors do not copy me because I am the first one who started selling this product," she said.

Another kombi for forgotten Bulembu

BULEMBU residents can finally breathe a sigh of relief after another kombi was finally introduced to their route.

For the past three weeks the residents of Bulembu were faced with the inconvenience of having only one kombi to transport them to and from Pulsala.

One of the residents of Bulembu and kombi driver John Maziya said the road was too bad thus transport operators were not keen to have their vehicles operate in that route.

"The truth is that the road to Bulembu is extremely bad, it is 18 kilometres of pure gravel that does nothing but destroy automobiles thus kombi owners and operators do not like servicing that route. The residents of Bulembu had to wait for hours as



the one kombi would only make the trip to and from Bulembu three times a day meaning that you will wait for four hours between trips," Maziya said.

Suffering Maziya said areas like Bulembu were for-

gotten by people and the media who do not live there thus people end up suffering. He said the road to Bulembu was terrible but apparently no one cared and people were forced to pay E15 to town or back to the forgotten village.

In the past, the area had three kombies, the first one blew its engine and the owned did not fix it because it was costly. The second one was involved in an accident over three weeks ago due to the bad mode conditions, leaving just one kombi to serve the entire community.

Swaziland boasts 25 years polio-free

swaziland has joined the rest of the African region in commemorating the African Vaccination Week (AVW) and brings 25 years of being polio free on its cards.

The last polio case was clinically diagnosed and reported in 1989.

AVW is commemorated from April 24-30 and this year's campaign would focus on polio eradication and it would be themed 'close the immunisation gap. Stay polio free!' and the slogan is 'vaccinated communities; healthy communities'.

Polio (poliomyelitis) mainly affects children under the age of five.

One in 200 infections leads to irreversible paralysis. Polio cases worldwide have decreased by over 99 percent since 1988, from an estimated 350 000 cases then, to 74 reported cases in 2015. Only two countries, Afghanistan and Pakistan remain polioendemic. In Swaziland, the last polio case was clinically diagnosed and reported in 1989.

"There has been no imported or indigenous wild polio virus case in the country in the last 25 years," WHO Expanded Programme on Immunisation (EPI) Officer Lonkululeko Khumalo said.

Khumalo pointed out however, that importation of wild polio virus (WPV) could not be prevented until global polio eradication is achieved but its spread within the country can be controlled.

She emphasised that detection of wild polio virus in a polio-free country was a public health emergency.

"It is against this background that the World Health Organisation (WHO) supported the country to develop an outbreak preparedness and

response plan. This plan provides guidance in case of an importation of WPV or detection of WPV case in order to maintain the polio free status," she said.

Khumalo said Swaziland had an active surveillance system in place for detection of polio virus where all suspected cases of acute flaccid paralysis were reported and investigated immediately and tested for polio virus.

Isolated

As soon as a case of WPV was isolated, an immediate investigation would be done commencing within 72 hours to identify the scope of the response activities based on such factors as the known extent of transmission AFP surveillance quality, major transit routes, international borders and origin of the WPV case.

"Despite these achievements it should be noted that in Swaziland some children are still not being immunized due to numerous reason. We encourage parents and caretakers to bring children for immunization to sustain and strengthen the gains made," Khumalo said.

The African vaccination

week is one of the opportunities to strengthen immunization and give services during the commemoration through partnership, advocacy, communication and education.

She explained that for the celebration of this year's AVW, and in line with this important milestone in the history of polio eradication initiative. It would be critical that the country continues to strengthen the routine immunisation programs to sustain the gains and also to provide a platform for integration of high impact interventions to promote population's health.

The last polio campaign in the country was conducted in June and July 2004 as the final round prior to certification of polio eradication in Swaziland. The campaign was nationwide and covered all four regions.

A total of 161 902 children under five years were vaccinated and a coverage of 85.2 percent was achieved at national level. Additionally, two rounds of polio supplementary immunization activities were integrated with measles follow up campaign in 2002 and 2013 country wide.

MZUTHINI'S ULTIMATE TEST

On Friday, during his 48th birthday celebrations held at King Sobhuza II Memorial Stadium in Nhlangano, His Majesty King Mswati III announced parole for prisoners. At the time immediate numbers were not

With the picture now becoming clearer, with hundreds of prisoners home, the big test starts for His Majesty Correctional Services Commissioner General Mzuthini Ntshangase, who has been trumping up correctional rehabilitation methods, aimed at helping the inmates to reform.

In helping them reform, he has exposed them in a number of community work and taught them various skills, all aimed at making them better people once they get out of prison. With about 240 inmates already home, the challenge is for them to manage their own reintegration back into society.
The challenge they face is that of being viewed

as people who have reformed, people who have served their time for whatever transgression they might have made They deserve to be given the benefit of doubt

that they have really learnt and further coping with the challenges of surviving and staying free of crime.

This time it will not be easy as they need all of us to support them, in order to make Ntshangase's work meaningful

Any person who has served his/her time in jail already has a bad record from which he/she needs to work from in order to get a simple thing like a job.

Companies don't hire or employ any person who has a criminal record. If it is difficult for one to be hired on the basis of criminal record, imagine starting a business. Financial institutions will have it tough to risk their clients' money to someone who has a criminal record, no matter the skills or capability of the ndividual to deliver the task or job asked of

That's where as society and family members we need to come in and help them use their newly acquired skills to make a living. We need to encourage them to continue to do what they were doing whilst inside jail, that is hand work and ensure that we provide surety wherever we can in order to give them self-confidence and self-belief that they can beat the temptations of going back to crime. Doing crime is simple, because no one demands of you of any clean criminal record and things like that, but your experience only. We don't want them to go back hence we need to see how we welcome them back into society. Most of those who are already out, are people who were left with four months or less before the completion of their sentences, so by extension they had already served their time. We need to welcome them and appreciate that it will not be easy like the first time when they had no criminal record, hence we need to encourage them and understand that for them

The simple issue of getting a job, is not as easy as we can imagine, hence much of what they will survive with is what they do with their

Let's meet Mzuthini half way as he tries his best to make them law abiding citizens again. On the other hand, we should also encourage the Correctional Services to keep contact with the King's former guests to see how they are doing and if they can make any intervention at a national level aimed at dealing with their needs. That would be being pro-active than waiting for them to commit crime and return to jali again.



HIV and AIDS profoundly and negatively impact economic growth.

This column has written extensively on this subject.

However, economic growth can positively affect HIV and AIDS eradication. 2016 has seen the establishment of the trans-African Tripartite Free Trade Area (TFTA) move beyond the drawing board and into a reality that impacts Swazis' health as well as economic fortunes.

It works like this: With the integration of African countries' economies and the lessening of cross-border trafficking restrictions, healthcare for Africans will receive a boost.

This is a development which is important for people's lives as more tax revenue and the elimination of passport controls at border posts would be seen.

First raised as a possibility last year, the Cairo-to-Cape Town Tripartite Free Trade Area was launched in Cairo, Egypt, in June 2015. As a trade bloc, TFTA is actually bigger than the European Union (EU). For Swaziland, whose sugar industry profits largely from EU sales, the TFTA presents a lucrative way to augment or possibly be an alternative to EU sales.

This TFTA spans 26 nations in Africa, whose combined populations are more than 600 million people. The creation of this trade bloc is a positive step towards improved investment flow and the facilitation and flow of goods in the region.

Emphatically, Swaziland's membership in the trade bloc will promote more active trade between the country and the rest of the continent. TFTA will enhance

trade facilitation and improve the flow of goods in the region by reducing bureaucratic complexity and lowering transit times and the cost of trading.

Swaziland will have access to

the East African Community (EAC) nations, which means Swazi goods not only get a cost advantage from reduced import taxes into the EAC, but also may be exported from there to the Middle East markets

served by East Africa. Essentially, the TFTA will make Africa an easier place to do business for African companies.

This includes healthcare companies, health insurance providers, pharmaceutical companies and private hospitals and clinics whose chains of facilities are spread throughout several countries.

With transportation costs and the cost of trading within Africa reduced because of TFTA, HIV and other drugs will see a price

Hospital supplies should also be cheaper. Drugs and

> including sophisticated electronic diagnostic equipment for HIV and for AIDS-related

supplies,

illnesses, can be sourced from a far greater number of African countries and be less expensive because of reduced trade barriers brought about by the new African trade bloc.

African medical personnel will be more available to assist Swaziland's efforts to reduce HIV and AIDS. Over time visa restrictions will be amended as

travel liberalisation for Africans between Africa increases. All these reforms have been tried regionally, between countries of a region, and bilaterally between two countries. With TFTA the entire conti-

nent will bene-

fit, once all nations join. Right now not all of West

Africa is included in TFTA. The total number of countries represents about half of Africa.

Nor are some island nations members yet, although their contribution to Africa's overall economy is not great. They are not subject to transportation or border reforms because they cannot be reached by road or rail, which are the two primary movers of goods and people in Africa.

According to the World Trade

Organisation (WTO), TFTA will increase Swaziland's overall trade volumes due to a lessening of restrictions on this country's goods exported to other African countries. The same reality applies to health care. More access to other African countries healthcare systems, expertise and equipment can be expected.

However, TFTA also offers Swaziland an opportunity to establish healthcare firms that now have a better chance of profitability than a few days ago before TFTA was formalised. New companies that might manufacture healthcare equipment, from test tubes and surgical gloves to complex electronic equipment, will have access to the economies of dozens of new countries, making sales easier. Such start-up firms might have been discouraged before by the size of Swaziland's local market, but now can look beyond even SADC nations for trade; all the way to Northern Africa.

SADC is just one of the three regional trading blocs that make up the tripartite grouping of TFTA.

The other two are the EAC and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA). The tree constituent regional organisations have more than trade on their agenda. SADC, for instance, deals with health and security issues, and a range of matters pertaining to the lives of its member countries' peoples.

For purposes of lowering healthcare costs, and providing a larger availability of drugs, essential equipment and even medical personnel, TFTA through its sheer size offers a promising new opportunity for Swaziland.

By increasing Swaziland's overall trade with Africa, TFTA will offer new tax revenue for government, which in turn can be used in the HIV battle and to improve healthcare services.

UNHEARD STORIES: Theatre festival about sexual violence

LISTEN ACT RISE

"THERE's something bizarrely liberating about being able to stand up on stage, as a character, and say I was raped.""

Perhaps not many actors would agree with this statement, but Gemma is telling me this after a rehearsal of my upcoming short play, in conversation with myself and the theatre director Tessa Hart. Together, we are collaborating on just one of 12 pieces in the upcoming UNHEARD Festival in London, a new writing festival exploring themes around sexual abuse and violence through performance at The Bread and Roses Theatre in Clapham, the festival may not be the most feel-good of entertainment options out there. But for those of us involved - and perhaps a great many survivors out there — it's a very important project.


Taboo

"There is a huge social taboo regarding the issue of sexual violence," says Tessa, founder of UNHEARD. "Oftentimes, it's a topic that people want to avoid.'

In fact, silence is most often the resounding response to the issue of sexual violence.

"Let's pretend that didn't happen. Let's ignore our friend's story of being raped. Let's just tell narratives that are positive and feel-good, even though they may mask the reality of what many people experience."

The reality is that many people out there - more than we're



willing to admit — are survivors of sexual violence. As the One Billon Rising campaign recently reminded us on V-Day, it's estimated that every one in three women (approximately one billion individuals on this planet) will be beaten, abused, or raped in her lifetime. Take, for example, the creatives involved in UNHEARD. Tessa is a survivor of sexual violence, I myself was raped when I was 29 and Gemma when she was 19.

"Each of us have had very different experiences, and yet, when you get a writer, an actor, and director — all of us rape survivors - in the same room, there is a collective urgency to share the common truth of our stories with an audience.

Resonates

"As an actor, you look for something within a character which resonates with you," Gemma explains. Even though she has told only a few friends about her own assault, the role of playing a rape survivor offers her a chance to explore the complex emotions she's had to encounter in her own life. "It's like I'm playing a version of myself, but with none of the negative connotations of being a rape victim.

In my play, 'Everything's Normal,' Gemma's character portrays how an adult rape survivor, years after her assault and largely recovered, still needs to mentally negotiate around the fact of her rape in a job interview, on a date or at a dinner party with friends. I wanted to address the pressure rape survivors can feel in trying to integrate back into everyday "normal" living. While I've already written a great deal about rape, this was a slightly different angle to explore. And in fact, the diverse line-up at UNHEARD presents a range of angles in these stories of sexual abuse and violence.

For Tessa, this multitude of voices inspired her to found UNHEARD in 2013, and expand the festival significantly in its future editions. When she made the call-out for plays exploring sexual violence, she received over 250 submissions from around the world, many with personal messages from artists grateful that such a festival existed.

Equally

"Clearly, there is a need for people to tell these stories, and I believe there is equally a need for audiences to hear them," she says. In addition to scratch nights featuring short plays like my own, there will be rehearsed readings, a poetry event, and repeat performances of The Vagina Monologues, Eve Ensler's iconic play which sparked the V-Day and One Billion Rising movement.

TalieMelnyk is travelling from New York to present the UK premiere of her one-woman play 'Maison des Reves'. Already an award-winner from the fringe circuit in New York and Canada, the play tells the truelife story of a woman in Imperial Russia, who killed over 300 men, seeing it as her duty to liberate women of her community from the brutality of sexual and domestic violence. Obviously, an extreme case of what can happen with this issue, but Talie

explains that audiences have been incredibly supportive of the play. One audience member came up to her after the show to share her own story: her own mother had died of domestic abuse, and in seeing the play, she had "found a huge sense of empowerment and release."

Perhaps it's that same sense of release which we are hoping will happen with UNHEARD both for the artists involved and for audiences. As Talie says, "It's important to put our stories out there, the broken, unspoken parts of who we are. If these stories make people uncomfortable, that's a good thing."

That discomfort with the topic has recently been challenged in the media - and by this this, I don't just mean the rape story lines in blockbuster TV series like House of Cards or Downton Abbey. I mean undergraduate Emma Sulkowicz's ongoing "Mattress Performance" to protest her alleged rapist's continued presence on the Columbia University campus, and the plethora of university rape survivors speaking up on social media, and every single one of Bill Cosby's victims who has come forward with her story, even though it might bring stigma and scrutiny onto herself. Survivors' stories are coming to the fore, and live theatre - perhaps the most immediate and visceral of art forms - can play an important role in opening up the public understanding about sexual violence.

Nuanced

Of course, rape has haunted theatre for centuries, but it's rarely represented in a nuanced, realistic way, drawn from the experience of the survivor. Just think of the climax of 'A Streetcar Named Desire' Stanley Kowalski rapes Blanche DuBois (off-stage, of course)and she is ruined for life.

I heard a similar phrase in the media after news of my own assault spread in Belfast - "this poor girl, her life is ruined"-a woman said on the radio. But that is perhaps one of the most damaging and pervasive tropes about rape which gets propagated. Yes, sexual violence can have a devastating effect on one's life. Yes, your life may never be the same after that experience. But no, it doesn't mean you're permanently ruined. You can recover. You can reclaim your voice and share your story, so others can find strength in it.

Audiences also have a chance to hear at least some of those stories which normally go



THE South African judiciary is yet again put under scrutiny and strangely today those who sang its praises a week ago are currently crying foul.


On the April 21, 2016 South African opposition parties rose to question the much trusted and loved judiciary.

OVER 100 000 CAT RISK OF DYING FROM HUN

AS winter nears, an estimated 108 246 cattle are at serious risk of dying from hunger due to poor nutrition, according to the ministry of agriculture production outlook 2016.

Livestock production was also hugely affected last year, as over 60 000 cattle died due to the drought.


In the production outlook report 2016, Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati said the remnant animals were still in fair to good condition, but would deteriorate during the winter period unless significant rainfall was received.

"Therefore, it is advisable that they should be culled to fetch reasonable income while also receiving the rangelands to enable their recovery," he said.

He said the Swaziland Dairy Board (SDB) had been tasked to ensure that hay bales were readily available at strategic locations.

Vilakati said the ministry would continue implementing water harvesting projects like earth dams and medium to large scale dams to increase water supply.

"Government remains commit-

ted to continue assisting farmers to remain in meaningful production," said Vilakati.

The projected loss of cattle could have an adverse effect on the country's beef exports as the Swaziland Meat Industries (SMI) mostly sourced the cattle from small holder farmers who often grazed their cattle communally.

SMI exports beef to markets including South Africa, Mozambique, European Union

(EU), and European Fair Trade Association (EFTA).

Meanwhile, Vilakati has commended the private sector for the strides made in the cultivation of maize under irrigation.

"The target is to plant 6 000 hectares of maize under irrigation. Currently, approximately 2 000 hectares have already been planted," he said.

"The ministry would like to appreciate the cooperation exhibited by the private sector in ensuring the success of this initiative," he added.

Sympathy

However, he also expressed sympathy to the sugar industry. for the serious losses to be incurred as a result of the drought.

Adding, he said the ministry had directed the National Maize Corporation to source maize to cover the shortfall to meet national requirements.

According to yield estimates, maize yields were estimated to drop to 33 460 metric tonnes for the cropping season resulting in a deficit of about 96 540 metric

Vilakati pleaded those who would be able to harvest something to store and treat their produce in a proper manner to avoid post harvest losses.

As well as vegetable production also came under a severe shock and was reduced by about 80 percent. This has resulted in the soaring of vegetable prices to almost 220 percent of the normal prices.

However, the minister said they had been informed that the situation would improve to normal winter and summer seasons, hence government would continue providing subsidised inputs to farmers to ensure that the country becomes self-sufficient in maize production.

"Farmers are encouraged to take full advantage of the decentralised soil testing services to condition their soils in preparation for the new season," he said.

The ministry analysis showed that over the last decade, there had been a steady to rapid decline in the yields of maize which had been estimated at 20 percent due to soil acidity. Therefore, government, through the ministry of agriculture, had been decentralising soil testing units in preparation for the next coming planting season.

SRA has E6.2bn domestic revenue collection target

COMBINED taxes are expected to contribute to about E6.2 billion to the country's revenue pool in the 2016/17 financial

Value Added Tax (VAT) was projected to increase from E2.2 billion the previous year to reach E2.3 billion in 2016/17, accounting for 16 percent of total revenue, while Corporate Tax and Pay as You Earn (PAYE) were projected to increase by 13.3 percent and 4.8 percent to E1.7 billion and E2.2 billion, respectively, which equals to about E6.2

Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) Balance of Payments and International Affairs Manager, Jabulani Dlamini said despite the fall of the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) revenue, which accounted for about 37 percent of government's total revenues and grants in 2016/17, domestic revenue was set to

increase by 12 percent.

He was speaking during the Swaziland Economic Development conference held last Wednesday at the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) Sports Emporium.

"Domestic revenue is set to increase by 12 percent as a result of an improvement in domestic revenue collection, courtesy of the Swaziland Revenue Authority's (SRA) continued efficiency in tax collection and administration," he said.

Increase

Grants are set to increase from E329 million to reach E813 million accounting for 6 percent of total revenue in 2016/17.

"Thanks to the European Union (EU), which has supported government, especially in the agriculture sector over the years," he said.

Under the 11th European Development Fund, the EU extended over E800 million in grant funds to government.

He said total expenditure was

estimated to increase to E20.7 billion in 2016/17 from the revised figure of E17.6 billion the previous fiscal year, with recurrent expenditure accounting for 74 percent (E15.3 billion) of total spending.

Dlamini said capital expenditure was expected to increase by 36 percent to E5.4 billion.

Projects

The key projects earmarked for the capital expenditure include the completion of Sicunusa-Nhlangano Road, completion of Sikhuphe-Hlane Road, construction and upgrading Manzini-Mbadlane Road, amongst government priority projects.

Meanwhile, Dlamini said the vision for the financial sector in Swaziland was to create a stable, diversified, modern, and competitive financial system that provides quality, affordable and accessible financial services to all to support economic develop-

He said the sector's objectives were to ensure the stability of the

financial system, diversify the financial system and its resources, mordenise the financial sector, and broaden financial inclusion.

He said based on the Finscorp study 2014 the level of financial inclusion in the country continued to improve. "According to the study, about 65 percent of the adult population is currently using some type of formal financial products," he said.

However, there are still some barriers to the financial sector which include affordability.

"About 34 percent cannot maintain minimum balance, 13 percent say don't need banking services, 10 percent say bank charges are too high, seven percent, and four percent say they don't understand how bank works," said Dlamini.

The diagnostic of the scope of financial inclusion in Swaziland was carried in 2014 for four product markets, which were credit, payments, savings, and insurance.

Islamists behead Canadian hostage

MANILA - Islamic militants in the Philippines have beheaded a Canadian hostage, sparking fears for more than 20 others they are holding on remote islands, with security forces vowing yeserday to hunt down the extremists. The man's head was found Monday dumped outside city hall on Jolo, a mountainous and jungle-clad island in the far south of the Philippines that is a stronghold of the Abu-Sayyaf Islamist group. *Reuters*

Fire destroys rare collections

NEW DELHI - A massive fire gutted a natural history museum in the Indian capital destroying rare specimens of flora and fauna, the Indian environment minister said. The blaze broke out overnight on the sixth floor of the building that houses the museum in central Delhi and rapidly engulfed the other floors, a fire official said. Thirty-five fire fighters battled for hours to extinguish the blaze and five of them were taken to hospital suffering smoke inhalation, a fire department official told AFP. Reuters

Party organiser found guilty

TAIPEI – The organiser of a party which saw a fireball rip through a Taiwan waterpark leaving 15 dead was found guilty of negligence yesterday and jailed for almost five years, as the court paid tribute to the "excruciating pain and torment" of the bereaved. Lu Chung-chi, owner of Colour Play Asia, was behind the event at Formosa Fun Coast where coloured corn starch being sprayed on around 1 000 partygoers ignited under the heat of stage lights last June, sending them running for their lives and leaving hundreds injured. *Reuters*

Police kill 152 over past two years

TEGUCIGALPA - Honduran police killed 152 people over the past two years in various operations with no probes carried out into their use of lethal force, a violence watchdog told AFP on Monday. The issue of deadly police action is in the headlines in Honduras following press revelations of official documents that appear to show that a cabal of senior police officers took payoffs from a drug kingpin to murder a top anti-drugs official in 2009 and a government security adviser in 2011. The scandal has galvanised Honduras to step up a purge of the police force.

TRUMP, CLINTON CLOSE TO DEAD HEAT IN NATIONAL POLL

NEW YORK - The Republican Party could have had a slam dunk election in 2016 pollsters say, but not with their two highly unlikable candidates – Donald Trump and Ted Cruz – leading the ticket.

A new George Washington University Battleground Poll came out yesterday, which shows Trump losing to Hillary Clinton by three points and getting trounced by Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders.

However, another type of Republican would have had better luck. "The Republican Party has a strongly favourable political environment for winning the White House," said the Tarrance Group's Ed Goeas, one of the Republican pollsters who conducted the bipartisan survey.

"If a mainstream Republican candidate were the presumptive nominee, the GOP would likely be in a strong position for a lot of wins, top to bottom in November," he

added. Instead the GOP has Trump or maybe Cruz, which more than half of the American surveyed view unfavourably.

Trump, of all the candidates on

both sides, has the worst numbers, with 65 percent of likely voters saying they disliked him.

Cruz and Clinton are about on par, with 55 percent of respondents

saying they disliked the Texas senator, while 56 percent said they didn't care for the Democratic former secretary of state.

Sanders and Ohio Gov. John Kasich, who are both still in the race, but have a very steep climb to the nomination, are-the only two candidates more than half of the country doesn't dislike.

Sanders' unfavourable rating stands at 44 percent, while Kasich's is at 29 percent. "There is bad news aplenty here for both parties. Voters are disheartened, discouraged about the future and disdainful of the leading candidates in both parties," said Christopher Arterton, the founding dean of the GW Graduate School of Political Management, in the poll's release.

"On many important issues, the public seems to lean toward the Republican party, setting the stage for an election that could go their way," Arterton continued.

JO'HANNEBSURG - The recall of former president Thabo Mbeki and the expulsion of Julius Malema from the ANC were the ruling party's biggest mistakes because in each case, those sympathising with Mbeki and Malema respectively formed parties opposing the ANC.

ANC national executive committee (NEC) member Ruth

term as president of the country.

Bhengu added that expelling Malema, who now leads the EFF, has made things worse for the ANC.

Her comments come shortly after
Tshwane Mayor
Kgosientso
Ramokgopa told the
Sunday Times the
EFF's growing popularity posed a serious threat to the ANC in the region in the August local government

elections.

Bhengu told the ANC regional general council in the Peter Mokaba region, which was meeting to discuss President

Jacob Zuma's apology following the Constitutional Court judgment on Nkandla, that Mbeki's recall led to the formation of

the Congress of the

People (COPE).

"COPE was not born because of its policies; it was formed by ANC

members who sympathised with Mbeki.

"ANC members who sympathised with Malema became the building blocks of the EFF."

This had negatively affected ANC membership.

Debacles

Bhengu said lessons learnt by the party through the Mbeki and Malema debacles were among the reasons why the ANC could not fire President Jacob Zuma.

"We should not take decisions that will further divide the ANC."

Court orders Vodacom to pay inventor

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's highest legal authority, the Constitutional Court, has ruled that Vodacom must compensate the inventor of the Please Call Me SMS product.

The court yesterday morning found Vodacom was bound by an agreement with Kenneth Nkosana Makate who has said he invented the Please Call Me concept.

Makate conceived the Please Call Me concept in November 2000 and he approached Vodacom's director and head of product development at the time, Philip Geissler, about the idea, according to a summary from the Constitutional Court judgment.

Geissler and Makate then reached an oral agreement that Vodacom would experiment with the idea.

"If it proved commercially viable, Mr Makate would be paid a share of proceeds from the product subject to terms to be negotiated between him and Mr Geissler. Vodacom implemented the idea in March 2001," reads the summary of the Constitutional Court judgment. *Fin24*

'We have no links to the Guptas'

JOHANNESBURG - The department of home affairs is the latest organisation to be accused of engaging in suspect business practices with the Gupta family.

DA MP Haniff Hoosen on Friday accused the department of awarding its visa-applications facilitation tender to VFS Global because of its links to the Guptas.

But VFS Global has denied having links to the Guptas, saying it was a case of mistaken identity. The claims, the company said, had exposed it to serious reputational damage.

In parliament, Hoosen alleged that, despite home affairs appointing VFS Global to handle South African visa applications, a receipt he received showed that money was being paid to a company called Islandsite Investments, of which Duduzane Zuma and Rajesh Gupta were directors

VFS Global Africa Chief Operating Officer Jiten Vyas said Hoosen had not looked into the finer details.

He said the misinformation stemmed from the lack of differentiation between the Gupta- and Zuma-owned Islandsite Investment 255, and the VFS-owned Islandsite Investment 309, which were in no way linked.

"Unfounded and untrue statements were made linking VFS Global to [the Guptas]," said Vyas.

Home Affairs Director-General Mkuseli Apleni also denied the claims, saying all the correct procedures had been followed when awarding the tender. He said he could not answer questions about with whom VFS did business provided there was no threat to the department.

"This company had to be vetted ... because we needed to know whom we were dealing with and make sure it was not a threat to the country."

ANC opens treason case against Malema

JOHANNESBURG - The ANC has officially opened a case of treason against EFF leader Julius Malema, it said on Monday.

Walus loses bid for freedom

PRETORIA - Janusz Walus, the Polish immigrant who murdered SACP leader Chris Hani 23 years ago, has lost his application for his immediate release on parole.

Judge Nicolene Janse van Nieuwenhuizen in the North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria dismissed Walus' application for his immediate release while appeal proceedings against a March 10 ruling that he must be released on parole within 14 days was pending.

Walus and former Conservative Party
MP Clive Derby-Lewis, who supplied the
weapon Walus used to shoot Hani to death
in the driveway of his Benoni home in
1993, were sentenced to death for the murder in October 1993. Their death sentences
were commuted to life imprisonment in

in 2013, but Justice Minister Michael
Masutha turned down his application in
April last year. He then launched a review
application and Judge Van Nieuwenhuizen
on March 10 set aside the minister's decision and order and ordered that he must be

Construction industry hit by increasing steel prices

THE local construction industry has been hit by increasing steel prices in South Africa due to the introduction of steel import levies by the South African government.

This has resulted from the introduction of levies by South Africa, the currency volatility together with other upward costs driving influences including unplanned furnace breakdowns and load shedding.

For the past four months, steel prices have increased between 15-20 percent, with the most recent increase due in May 2016 shortly after being announced around mid-April

An industry expert who preferred to comment on condition of anonymity said the effect of these extremely unpredictable price increases upon the developmental projects in Swaziland, could result in a total halt on some projects which do not have contractual price escalation clauses between the client and supplier or service provider and a less dramatic influence upon those project, which in fact do have the said contractual price escalation clauses, whereby the client or supplier has built in allowances for price escalations in

their costs or budgets.

"In the case of the former, the influence is extremely dramatic and will affect all, down to the lowest levels, since the provider companies could face financial ruin if they had invested in plant and equipment in order to provide services or products, and or had supplied their products or services in a large way into the projects and could not be reimbursed for such and also the employees of these companies would lose their source of income and thus all their dependants would face potential destitution through job loss," he said.

Influence

He said in the case of the latter, the influence could be less dramatic in the short to medium term, since the said projects might be caused to progress at a slower than initially planned rate by mutual agreement in an attempt to "wait out" the price increase phase and accelerate the project in a price decrease phase, although these types of projects usually had inherent time penalty clauses and thus would not be beneficial to the contractor, supplier or service providers.

"Price movement in the steel industry is not predictable as there are too many influencing factors beyond any significant single entity's control, and therefore the

planned income on the part of all affected parties could be affected to larger or lesser degrees by these influences," he said.

Given in part, His Majesty King Mswati's commitment to Swaziland achieving first world status by 2022 as well as other governmental, parastatal and foreign interests investing in the infrastructural development in Swaziland, the country is currently enjoying rather inordinate stimulation in the construction and manufacturing industries, unlike South African neighbours whom are in comparatively major developmental depression.

The expert said construction projects such as the International Conference Centre and Five Star Hotel in Ezulwini, upgrading of Gege to Nhlangano Road, upgrading of Manzini to Sikhuphe Airport Road, new United Nations (UN) building in Mbabane, the proposed Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) Headquarters in Ezulwini, upgrading of the Lavumisa Border Post, and upgrading of the Manzini to Matsapha Highway, just to name a few, were in themselves worth billions of emalangeni. Let alone other projects relating to state, parastatals and foreign aid funded fencing projects and the likes, worth many more millions of

...THERE IS NEED FOR INNOVATIVE DESIGNS

THE expert says due to the increasing prices of steel design, engineers are being squeezed to look at more innovative designs in order to use less or no steel products to become less independent on steel products.

The country imports all steel products from or through South African.

He said this was critical as it was globally well known that the Chinese steel industry had grown massively in the last ten to 15 years and with the current global economic slump, the capacity of Chinese steel industry far outstrips the global demand for steel products, thus the Chinese, in an effort to sustain their massive steel manufacturing industry, have driven the price of steel down in the recent past, by approximately 25 percent in Southern Africa (2015) and supply steel products worldwide

In response to sustain their local steel manufacturing industry, who had found it increasingly difficult to compete against imported Chinese steel prices, the South African government imposed import levies on imported steel products in general and have achieved a reasonable degree of success in this regard.

"Since the price of steel products have progressively increased over the long term, design engineers and the ordinary man in the street will and have been forced to begin looking at more innovative designs in order to use less or no steel products and alternative cost effective materials to use in order to achieve the same end, thus becoming less dependent on steel products," he concluded.

"It is needless to say these projects all create wealth opportunities for locally based companies, be they construction, supplier or contractor based to greater or lesser degrees," he said.

"Not to mention the aforementioned companies employees whom will naturally also benefit from this economic stimulation, since the majority of these projects require the establishment and continuous supply of basic amenities and support services for the duration of the projects and in most cases maintenance of these same amenities and services long after completion," he added.

In short, this developmental stimulation had economically far reaching positive job creation and sustainability influences on our local populace in general.

Environmental impact assessment to determine viability of thermal plant

SWAZILAND Environment Authority (SEA) Executive Director Stephen Zuke has cautioned that only the environmental impact assessment study would determine whether the proposed thermal plant would be environmentally viable.

A study conducted by Journal of Energy in Southern Africa showed there was plenty of evidence that a coal powered power station produced by green gases could be detrimental to the environment.

"Fossil Fuel burning to produce electricity does generate green house gases that cause global warming. However, as economies and scientists improve, we now do have technologies that help to reduce these emissions," Zuke said.

Swaziland is party to a variety of intergovernmental protocols and conversions that focus on issues regarding the environment and this raised the question whether a thermal plant would result in a breach of these international conventions.

For instance, the country ratified the Kyoto protocol, which was an environmental international treaty committing state parties to reduce greenhouse gases emissions.

"It is our hope that the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) process by which we subject such developments, shall objectively identify the most appropriate technologies to apply which will help minimize these impacts," he said.

Asked about possible substitutes for thermal as it was known to emit green houses gases which could harm the environment, Zuke said the authority supported renewable sources of energy such as wind and solar energy.

"However, for an uninterrupted supply to meet the ever-increasing demand for electricity, many developers are still pursuing the use of fossil fuels such as coal," he said.

"The executive cautioned that in such a case SEA recommends investment in the technologies that will reduce the emissions drastically despite their high capital cost.

"Until we have assessed the mitigation measures suggested in the EIA document, it would be premature for us to throw away the suggested thermal project," he concluded.

If we can't manage the imported cabbages; why can't

we grow for ourselves and sell the remainder? Basic subsistence farming gives birth to commercial farming. We have tripped into planting flowers and grass while we still import our stable food.



appear superhuman, colourful costumes and make-up are used in Theyyam dances.


"The dancer has to lay on the ground to let the make-up artists draw on their face. It takes hours and extreme skill.


NIGERIAN GOVT STILL OWES SALARIES

ABUJA - Despite a massive bailout by the Federal Government last year, dozens of states still cannot pay their workers for many months.

Daily Trust investigations in the past week have shown that majority of Nigeria's 36 states owe workers between one to nine months in unpaid salaries.

The states were in dire straits by the middle of last year with most of them being unable to pay workers and carry out basic functions of government.

As a result a total of N662 billion bailout funds were renegotiated for 27 states in July last year, with 19 states receiving N222 billion from the CBN in September,

2015.

The CBN approved N338 billion loans to 27 states to pay outstanding salaries at nine percent interest rate over a 20-year-peri-

od.

But despite this, most of these states are still unable to pay workers salaries. The most affected workers are primary and secondary school teachers, health workers, and traditional rulers among others.

Some of the states owing salaries include Kaduna, Kwara, Plateau, Benue, Borno, Yobe, Imo, Taraba, Kogi, Bauchi, Delta, Oyo, Nasarawa and Ogun.

Those who are managing to pay have slashed the salaries between 30 to 50 percent, while others have stopped paying leave grants, pensions and other workers entitlements.

Over 2 000 teachers in Kaduna are yet to get their salaries for over six months now, Daily Trust reports. Some teachers in the state have been finding it difficult to get their monthly pay. *AFP*

SANDF members still missing at sea

JOHANNESBURG - The two members of the South African National Defence Force (SANDF) who went missing at sea in Port St Johns on April 2016 have not yet been located and are still declared missing at sea, the SANDF announced on Monday. The SANDF said the search and rescue mission was still active. The missing members are staff sergeant Mcedisi Rudolf Mandyu, 48, who works at the SA Army Infantry School in Oudtshoorn, and Private Themba Nelson Sithole, 27, who works at 1 Para Battalion in Bloemfontein. Reuters

ICC to investigate Burundi violence

DOHA - The international war crimes court will investigate allegations of imprisonment and violence in Burundi, which has been plagued by unrest since a political crisis erupted a year ago. The office of the UN Commission on Human Rights estimates at least 430 people have been killed in Burundi since April 2015, when President Pierre Nkurunziza launched a bid for a third term in office. He went on to win a disputed election in July. *AFP*

Ghana, Togo boost security after warning

ACCRA - Security has been beefed up in Accra and Lome following a leaked intelligence report that indicated Islamist militants were likely to launch their next attacks in Ghana and Togo. In Ghana's capital, there has been an increased visible police presence in public places such as malls and beaches, while officers in plain clothes are also patrolling. Upmarket hotels such as the five-star Kempinski, Moevenpick and La Palm Royal Beach have likewise introduced measures such as thorough searches of vehicles and extra security guards. *Reuters*

Malaria deaths rising in Angola

LUANDA - Deaths from malaria in Angola this year look set to outstrip 2015 as a health crisis that includes one of the country's worst yellow fever outbreaks in decades spreads, the World Health Organisation said.

Angola recorded 2 915 deaths from malaria in the first quarter of this year, compared with 8 000 for the whole of 2015 and 5 500 the previous year, the WHO told Reuters on Monday.

Botswana backs EU plan on bans

GABORONE - The government of Botswana has said it supports the European Union's plan to ban the importation of trophies and proceeds from trophy hunts conducted in Southern Africa in a bid to prevent poaching and illegal hunting.

Early this month, the EU pledged to follow the United States example of banning the importation of trophies and trophy hunting products into the bloc to prevent the mass poaching of African wildlife, a move that has been bitterly opposed by the governments of Namibia and Zimbabwe as detrimental to conservation.

However, Botswana's Minister of Environment, Tourism and Wildlife Tshekedi Khama has come out in full support of the proposed ban, saying it would help to control poaching and limit the proliferation of illegal firearms.

"I think the ban is a welcome move. They should go all the way and see how best they can use it to help in anti-poaching efforts.


They should do more to end poaching, especially to control the flow of the guns which are used by poachers."

"They haven't informed us officially of the plan, and we are waiting to hear how they intend to achieve it, but we support them fully in this regards,"Khama said.

According to a draft EU policy plan released in Brussels early this month, the 28-member bloc wants to impose a complete ban on the importation of trophies and trophy hunting proceeds into the EU.

It also calls for the tightening of existing legislation to ensure that all trophies imported into the EU are legally obtained.

Global calls for the curtailment of trophy hunting in African conservancies erupted into a global outrage in July last year after the killing of 'Cecil the Lion' in the Hwange National Park by American doctor Walter Palmer. SABC NEWS

'Xenophobic attacks due to political discontent'

LUSAKA – Former Zambian president Guy Scott, has said the xenophobic attacks in the southern African country were a result result of "political discontent".

According to The Post, over 250 people were arrested for looting and rioting mostly in high density areas over rumours of ritual murders last week.

The violence started in Zingalume and George Jums in the capital Lusaka last week on Monday, in the wake of the murders of at least seven people, whose

SOUTH African based Swazi gospel artist Sipho Makhabane brought the house down at the **International Apostolic Faith** M'ssion (AFM) Greater Conference.

This event was held at the church's headquarters in Chatsworth, Masvingo from April 21 to 24th.

The conference was attended by delegates from 32 countries, including Swaziland, where AFM operates. Makhabane performed before over 100 000 congregants who attended the conference. He said he was excited at being invited to such a big conference adding that this was his first time in his over 30 years in the music industry to perform before such a massive crowd.

The artist said he was almost overcome by emotions when he saw the audience dancing and singing along to most of the songs he delivered during his set. "It was such an amazing experience, especially because the people came from over 30 different countries but still the majority of the audience could relate to my music. What also excited me the most is that I was the only artist outside the Faith Mission who was invited to perform at the conference," he said. 'Big Fish' performed at the conference on Saturday and Sunday adding that in both days he

received a good response from the massive audience. "My only challenge was that when I got there, the people demanded the old songs which I released in my early years in my music career.

Demanded

Those people demanded songs like Yekintokozo, Vuka Mphefumulo Wami, Calvari, Ziyaw'indonga and Ebenezer. They also demanded to hear 'The devil is a liar', over and over again. I was in a tight corner because I have not performed these songs in a long time. But the interesting thing is that the band had already mastered the songs, something which made things easier for me. But what I noticed is that the old songs made an impact to the whole of Africa hence the requests for me to play these songs," he added. He said receiving the invitation was humbling to him. "I got a call from the President of the Apostolic Faith Mission International, Professor Frank Chikane who told me that he wanted me to minister at their conference.

Believe

I couldn't believe it until I landed in Harare where I was chauffeured to the conference area, only to find multitudes of people eagerly awaiting my arrival," the elated 'Big Fish' said in a telephonic interview.

He reiterated that this was his first time to perform for such a massive

gathering adding that when he took the stage he could not see the end of the crowd as there were so many people there. "It was just like the sea where you just cannot see where it ends," he said. 'Big Fish' continues to command a huge following and respect from gospel music lovers and the general populace having been in the music industry for a long time.

Influential

Makhabane remains one of the most influential gospel musicians, not only in South Africa but the entire SADC region and beyond. He has released hits like 'Yekintokozo', 'Hambanami', 'Over and Over' and 'Devil is a Liar'. He recently released an album titled 'My Journey' which was influenced by the nasty accident he was involved in which almost took his life in December 2014.

Makhabane shared the stage with Zimbabwean musicians like; Pastor Charles and Amai Charamba, Sebastian Magacha,

Matthias Mhere, Zim Praise and Kudakwashe Mutsvene from within the church. AFM in Zimbabwe was established 100 years ago. It traces its origin to the Pentecostal Revival, which was started in 1901 at Bethel Bible School in Arkansas, Texas by Charles Parham. From Bethel Bible School emerged William J Saymour, a Pastor of a local Black Holiness Congregation who was especially intrigued by the doctrine of the Spirit Baptism. Apostolic Faith Mission was launched on the May 25, 1908 at Doomfontein, Johannesburg in South Africa by John G. Lake together with his companion Thomas Hezmalhalch. Through oral tradition, it emerged that Zimbabwean migrants who had gone into South Africa seeking jobs in mines and farms returned back home having been converted into the new Pentecostal movement from as early as 1909.

SEPP BLATTER TO BE A WITNESS IN PLATINI'S CASE


ZURICH - Michel Platini's appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport against his six-year FIFA ban will also be attended by Sepp Blatter.

Platini's office said yesterday that Blatter has been called by FIFA as a witness. The case will be heard on Friday in Lausanne, Switzerland.

Platini, the UEFA President, has been suspended for receiving a £1.4million payment in 2011 from Blatter, who was then the FIFA president. Blatter has also been suspended for six years, and both men deny any wrongdoing.

Blatter is also appealing to CAS, but his case will be heard at a later date. He has been replaced as FIFA president by Gianni Infantino.

Charges of corruption and falsification against Platini have been dropped by FIFA, which accuses him of conflict of interest and lack of loyalty.



Platini's office added that, despite FIFA's opposition, CAS will conduct Friday's hearing in French. Platini is French and has limited Englishspeaking abilities.

Last week Blatter insisted he had not been contacted by the FBI over an investigation into corruption during his 17-year reign at the head of FIFA.

A total of 39 people, executives and officials, are charged over bribery allegations but setting a date for a trial pencilled in for February next year has already been put back because of the mass of evidence collated.

Woods back on the golf course

...but refuses to set date for competitive return

LOS ANGELES - Tiger
Woods played what he said
were his first holes of golf since
August on Monday, but has yet
to set a date for his return to
competitive action.

Woods played five holes with former Open and Masters champion Mark O'Meara at the official opening of the course he designed at Bluejack National Golf Club.

It also emerged on Monday that the 14-time major winner had registered for the US Open at Oakmont in June, although that was something he had to do ahead of today's deadline to keep his options open.

Woods has not played since finishing joint 10th in the Wyndham Championship last year, after which he underwent two back operations in the space of six weeks.

In quotes reported by ESPN.com, Woods said: "I'm definitely a little tired but I feel pretty good. I haven't been out here playing like this. I hadn't played any holes until today. I know people have said I've played holes back at Medalist, but I haven't. This is actually the first time I've played holes since Wyndham. It's been a while.

"I'm just progressing. You saw how I was going at it today, nice and smooth. That's harder than I have been going at it the last month. Just gradually progressing. We're just trying to progress and I'm doing that."

The 40-year-old had been downbeat about his prospects of playing again at the end of last year, saying he could not see a light at the end of the tunnel and admitting anything he achieved now would be 'gravy'.

"I would not have said I would be here like this five months ago,' he added. "I wouldn't have thought I'd be able to do what I did here now. Or play with my kids again, things of that nature."

Dortmund won't forbid Mats Hummels departure DORTMUND - Mats Hummels is

DORTMUND - Mats Hummels is certainly a wanted man this summer, with Europe's giants eyeing up a big-money move and will have been boosted by Borussia Dortmund's admission the defender could leave.

Premier League sides Arsenal, Chelsea and Manchester United are known to be admirers, while Bayern Munich are keen to lure him away from their Bundesliga rivals.

And Dortmund supremo Hans-Joachim Watzke has admitted the club would be wrong to stand in the way of the 27-year-old should he wish to leave Signal Iduna Park.

The 28-year-old's deal at the Volkswagen Arena ran until June 2017 but the two parties have now parted ways.

Bendtner had not trained with the team for quite some time and was recently instructed not to turn up at all.

The striker joined Wolfsburg on a free transfer in the summer of 2014 and made 47 appearances, scoring nine goals, but things soured this season

Bendtner has been fined twice for breaches of discipline concerning training sessions.

In February, the Bundesliga club fined him for driving to training in a Mercedes S-Class when the club are owned by rival manufacturer Volkswagen.

A fortnight ago, Bendtner was forced to train alone and fined £1 770 for turning up 45 minutes late for a session.

Wolfsburg Sporting Director Klaus Allofs said he was disappointed the move for the former Gunner had not worked out and that he felt let down by the striker's performances.

"Both Nicklas and ourselves had high hopes of his engagement at Wolfsburg, but after two years, we have had to ascertain that the expectations were neither fulfilled for him nor for us and a continued cooperation made no sense for either side.

ATLETICO'S CHANCE **FOR BAYERN REVE**

MUNICH - Bayern Munich destroyed Atletico Madrid's dreams of winning the European Cup in 1974 and are out to wreck their hopes of reaching a second Champions League final in three years when they visit the Spanish capital for the semifinal first leg.

In the final in Heysel 42 years ago, an equaliser from defender Hans-Georg Schwarzenbeck in the final minute of extra time cancelled out Luis Aragones' opening goal and forced a replay, in which Bayern ran out 4-0 winners.

That outcome led to contrasting fortunes for both clubs - Bayern went on to win three consecutive European Cups and are now bidding for their sixth triumph in manager Pep Guardiola's last season in charge before taking over at Manchester City.

Atletico are still haunted by the memory of Schwarzenbeck's goal, which prompted the nickname 'el pupas' (the cursed

History repeated itself 40 years later when Atletico led Real Madrid 1-0 in the Champions League final and Sergio Ramos headed in a 93rd-minute equaliser to force extra time before going on to thrash the Rojiblancos 4-1.

Four decades after Schwarzenbeck robbed them of glory, Atletico are still chasing their first European Cup, yet are

emboldened in their bid to go all the way this year after knocking out holders and favourites Barcelona in the quarterfinals.

They beat Malaga 1-0 on Saturday thanks to substitute Angel Correa's second-half strike to stay level on points with Barcelona, who top La Liga due to their superior head-to-head record.

Bayern maintained their seven-point lead at the top of the Bundesliga by winning 2-0 at Hertha Berlin with second-half goals from Arturo Vidal and Douglas Costa. A victory at home to Borussia Monchengladbach next week will see Bayern clinch a third successive title under Guardiola.

favourites to reach the final in Madrid according to the statisticians.

Despite Pep Guardiola's side being the overall favourites, Madrid's route is seen as the easiest with a 68.5 per cent chance of getting past Manchester City, who will be led into their first Champions League semi-final by Manuel Pellegrini last night.

Today's semi is seen as slightly closer. though not by much, despite Atletico removing most people's favourites for the tournament - holders Barcelona - at

the quarter-final stage. Atletico have a 34 per cent chance of reaching the final in Milan on May 28, according to Bloomberg Sports.

A repeat of the 2014 Champions League final between the two Madrid sides is the second-most likely final, followed by an arguably even more mouth-watering clash between Guardiola and his employers for next season



'Madze' geared up for COSAFA

SOCCER-SIHLANGU head coach Harries 'Madze' Bulunga is hoping to rise from the 2015 Council of Southern Africa Football Associations (COSAFA) upset and set his charges on for yet another episode of the campaign in Namibia.

The local squad was unlucky not to make the quarterfinals of the COSAFA Castle Cup last year, but coach Harris 'Madze' Bulunga is hoping to use that disappointment to fuel his team's charge at the 2016 tournament to be held in Windhoek from June 11-25.

Swaziland beat both Lesotho and guest nation Tanzania in their first round pool 12 months ago, but a 1-1 draw with Madagascar saw the island nation pip them to top spot

in the group on goal-difference.

"It was memorable for us, you could say we performed in a way beyond the expectations of the nation, especially as we had just four days in camp before the tournament and people had written us off," said Bulunga.

He said they were unlucky to miss out on goal difference but the performance was pleasing and they carried that momentum into the Africa Nations Cup qualifiers that followed.

"We are in a position where we can still qualify for the Nations Cup finals in Gabon and that ground-work was laid at the COSAFA Castle Cup last year. That is what we hope to bring to the COSAFA Castle Cup in Namibia this year."

Bulunga suggests there will not be too many changes to the squad that has done duty over the past 12 months, but says they must also plan for the future and the COSAFA Castle Cup is the perfect platform to do that.

"We don't have a large pool of players to pick from and so we may try and give some of the players from the Under-23 team a taste of what it is like to play in a big international tournament. We have had pretty much the same team for

the past two years and with one or two players coming to the end of their careers, we don't want to be caught out further down the line, there must be some sort of succession planning in place," he added.

Bulunga believes that the COSAFA Castle Cup is the perfect stage for the national team to bring in new blood against very good quality opposition and in the pressure of a tournament where the stakes are high. He highlighted that they missed out on the World Cup qualifiers, losing 2-0 on aggregate to Nigeria, but that shows the capability to run the so-called powerhouses of the continent close and be competitive. Namibia this year became the fifth nation to win the COSAFA Cup since its inception in 1997. Zimbabwe and Zambia have four times each, while South Africa and Angola have each won on three occasions.

COSAFA Cup draw tomorrow

SOCCER - THE draw for this year's COSAFA Castle Cup will be conducted tomorrow in Windhoek, Namibia, as Sihlangu head coach Harries 'Madze' Bulunga is hoping to use last year's disappointment to fuel the boys to do better.

South Africa also contemplate using the tournament to prepare their Under-23 side for the Olympic Games in Brazil.

According to a statement from COSAFA, a total of 14 countries have entered the tournament, being hosted for the first time by Namibia, with the Democratic Republic of Congo, who won the CHAN-2016 tournament in Rwanda at the start of the year, invited to replace the Comoros Islands, who did not enter for a second successive year.

South Africa are among the six seeded countries, who will not have to participate in the first round group phase and want to send their Under-23 side to the event as they come in at the knockout stage when there are eight teams left.

The tournament has for several years now, because of problematic numbers, been divided into two parts.

Guaranteed

In the first week there is a group competition with two groups of four. These eight countries are the bottom eight in the rankings but each guaranteed three games. They will be Angola, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, the Seychelles, Swaziland and Zimbabwe.

The two group winners are then joined by the six top ranked nations (DR Congo, South Africa, Zambia, Botswana, Mozambique and Namibia) for the final knockout phase. But countries eliminated at the quarter-final stage still get to play at least one more match in a plate competi-

Originally scheduled for May, the tournament is now being staged from June 11-25, after hosts Namibia requested a change of dates.

They want to be able to use their strongest squad possible as they seek to defend the title they won in South Africa last year and would not have been able to call upon several of their key Premier Soccer League-based players had the tournament been played in the last two weeks of May as originally planned. This is because of club commitments.

Zambia and Zimbabwe have each won the COSAFA Cup on four occasions since the competition was first played in 1997. South Africa and Angola have three titles each, while Namibia claimed their first championship when they defeated Mozambique 2-0 in last year's final.

Sundowns salute Carmichael

The Managing Director (Mark) came at the darkest hour in the history of Sundowns when the team had been relegated to the National First Division back in 2008. Carmichael made an immediate impact at Sundowns where within weeks; he spearheaded a campaign to vote for the team in the SwaziTelecom Charity Cup.

Separating

He almost made history by being the first team in Swaziland to feature in this tournament while officially campaigning in the National First Division, coming fifth after Moneni Pirates with less than 1 000 votes separating the two teams. Under his leadership, the team went on to win promotion back to the premier league within a single season and was crowned National First Division Champions with three games to play in May 2009. He built a strong competitive team that won back-to-back Swazi Telecom Charity Cups in 2010 and 2011. The 'Downs family will never forget the Sundowns side that paraded the likes of skipper Jerome

Ntshalintshali, Trywell Kaira, Reagan Steenkamp, Jacob Mzokomba, Musa Shongwe, Alfred Musonda, Bobby Carrington, to mention but only a few. This team won the Swazi Telecom Charity Cup in 2010 and went on to lose the MTN League in the last day, settling for the bronze medal.

The team, under Kenny Ndlanzi and Rodney Charles, had a 16 game unbeaten run, the longest for Sundowns after the millennium. We vividly remember the Class of 2015 that was narrowly beaten by Manzini Wanderes in the Swazi Bank Cup semi-finals, the same team that lost to Mbabane Swallows in the semi-finals of the Castle Lager Premiership Challenge and also lost to the same team in the semi-finals of the Ingwenyama Cup in 2016. With Mark's development philosophy which is consistent with Sundowns' own long-term strategic plan, Downs has bred unknown players into household names today in Swazi football. We have also nurtured young boys who are in our national squads as we speak; Lwethu Simelane, Ntsika Simelane, Senzo Shongwe, Justice Figareto and Mbutfo Mtsetfwa are all with the National Under-20 team. Producing these players is no child's play. It needs resources in huge proportions and patience.

Illustrious

We have Phumlani Dlamini, Sandanezwe Mathabela and Phindafuthi Dlamini, all unknowns in Sihlangu. Phinda Ginindza also had a call-up. We have produced the National Under-23 captain in Mlamuli Nkambule. Furthermore, the chairman has developed Manzini Club from being a mere sub-standard training ground into a world class facility! The above traits illustrate an illustrious run by a leader who has been in football for only eight years. Congratulations are therefore in order. While the news that the MD contemplates leaving football may have come as a shock, we urge the Downs faithful not to panic. Sundowns was founded on the principles of honesty, integrity and transparency back in 1987. If our football in Swaziland is not run on such fundamental principles, then leaders like Carmichael are bound to be frustrated. Leaving may not be the solution, however. Good shall prevail over evil in the long run. People in the soccer fraternity are not fools. They can see beyond the mist and when called to act, they shall do so objectively. The destiny of our game is in our hands as Swazis. We cannot afford to lose visionaries like Mark.

Pretend

We cannot also afford to be naive as Swazis and pretend like all is well. A lot is wrong. Mark being Mark-ed Out is a tip of an iceberg. We need to be patriotic and stand up for our football and country. We will engage the MD as the Basop! Family and map a way forward. We will have to restrategise for we believe that Sundowns can be successful and win cups without changing our philosophies while also subscribing to the values in which we were founded. The team has been in three semi-finals in the past 12 months and that is an indicator that we can do it. 'Unity is Strength' and it is times like these that define who we are and if we really care about our team. If we love Sundowns, then these are times when we should demonstrate our love by being there for Sundowns.

Restart


At half-time the teams remained locked at 0-0. Sergio Aguero had a decent opening shortly after the restart, but his effort went over the bar.
