



King warns of briefcase investors

- As witnessed in other countries, King says such investors loot the country's natural resources and fly by night
- Gold to be kept as precious stone at the Central Bank

is Majesty King Mswati III has warned the nation to guard Lagainst briefcase investors who normally loot natural resources and fly by night without trace.

Speaking during the official opening of the Lufafa Gold mine at Pigg's Peak Hotel, the King said he had noted with concern that in other countries, briefcase investors normally came in posing as serious investors only to loot the country's natural resources and fly by night thus disappearing without trace.

He said with the opening of the gold mine, the good thing is that the processes of keeping gold at the Central Bank of Swaziland as a precious stone, had been fulfilled.

He called upon Swazis to make sure that the country does not have briefcase investors as witnessed in other countries.

With the mine having been opened, he put the onus upon the communities around the gold mine to safeguard it and always make sure that they monitor the project since they are close to it. This would ensure that the country's natural resource is pre-

Should they see abnormalities on the working procedures at the mine, the communities are expected to report same since this investment falls under their area.

Meanwhile, the King invited Swazis to open companies for refinery processes for the gold mine to work closely, with them stating that local business people should make use of the opportunity, which in turn will open more job opportunities for

His Majesty the first to mould gold bar

The King was taken through all the procedures and came up with a complete gold bar at the mine

is Majesty the King was yesterday the first to mould a gold bar before he officially opened the Lufafa

The King said he was happy that he made history by moulding the gold bar which is the first of its kind in the country.

"What is impressive about the mine is that there are experts who know what they are doing and I'm happy to announce that I was the first to mould a gold bar at the mine, which is the first of its kind," the King said much to a round of applause from the gathering.

When he first saw the gold at the mine, he thought it was just soil, but later discovered that there is in fact a lot of gold at Lufafa. On another note, he said since gold was heavy, the road infrastructure and bridges should be constructed in such a way that it was durable to handle the loads that would be transported.

He assured the nation that with the opening of the mine, a lot of development would be done since there would be schools and clinics. The road infrastructure would also improve as he witnessed that it was currently in a bad state.

The opening of the Lufafa Gold Mine has come with good news as a total of 400 jobs have been created and more are yet to come.

Does government have money for salary review?

here are serious doubts on whether government has included in the 2016/17 budget a provision of over E600 million to effect the proposed civil servants salary review whose report was released to public sector unions this week.

It would seem a further supplementary budget would be needed to implement the review, funds

That is if the words coming from the Minister of Finance Martin Gobizandla Dlamini on the matter during an interview with this newspaper yesterday are anything to go by. The Swazi Observer reported this week that government's monthly wage bill is set to increase by over E50 million to reach E430 million if the salary review for the country's civil service is implemented as proposed by the consultants.

LCC Capital Consulting were tasked with undertaking the salary

review exercise with the aim to facilitate the development of an enhanced environment for civil servants so that they remain equitably remunerated thus promoting increased efficiency in service delivery.

Over the recent months, there has been a hullabaloo by public sector unions who threatened to stage a nationwide strike to force government to make the report public. Following the release of the report, civil servants all over the country are now waiting anxiously to see if it will eventually be implemented by government as promised by the Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini last year.

Awaited

The eagerly awaited salary review report by LCC Capital Consulting was finally released by government to the public servants unions' representatives on Wednesday.

The minister of finance when asked to shed light on the matter after he had been scheduled to release the 2016/17 Budget

Speech on Thursday he for a moment giggled while gathering his thoughts on what to say next before he said the salary adjustment might be included or might not be in the budget he is now set to announce on Friday.

He had been asked on whether government had the money to implement the review, especially considering the pronouncement of belt tightening that His Majesty King Mswati III gave to the country when delivering the speech from the Throne when officially opening parliament a fortnight

"We haven't yet discussed the salary review report at Cabinet level. For now the report has only just been released by the consultant and we are still to meet and discuss it as Cabinet," was all the minister was willing to say on the subject despite that there have been reports that Cabinet and other stakeholders had been discussing the contents of the same report in recent weeks before the public sector unions started demanding that it be made public.

When it was put to him that he had been scheduled to deliver the 2016/17 Budget Speech in parliament this past Thursday and asked whether the provisions of the review report had been included in his speech, it was then that the minister said; "It might have been included or it might not have been included."

When further asked if it was possible that they could meet on the issue before he delivers the speech on Friday, the minister said it was possible.

This therefore brings to the fore the mind boggling question on whether the salary adjustment has been provided for or a supplementary budget would be needed to cover the costs of the review.

Worth noting is that the last review was conducted in 2004. and the next one was supposed to have been conducted in 2009. However, this was not implement ed taking into cognisance the unfavourable economic and financial position that government found itself in.

This was a fortnight ago.

The boiling situation can further be confirmed by the head of government's move to also allegedly ask the same church during a service a month back that they should pray for his wife whom he reported sick then.

Engaged

This is the same church where the prime minister and the love of his life got engaged to be married during a colourful event on Sunday 19 January 19, 2014.

During the engagement, the PM said he had met Joy in a rather very unusual, but unique way. He highlighted then that not even his escorts, Paul Zishwili in particular, could keep him away from what he saw when he met Maziya.

The ceremony attracted top government officials, cabinet ministers including the Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Paul Dlamini and legislators from both houses of parliament.

Describing his wife to be then, the prime minister mentioned that his sister (Lomagugu) had recognised Maziya's beauty even before he had introduced her.

He said her striking looks resembled one who was about to board a plane as observed by his sister.

Fast forward to 2016, it has been gathered from some of the Bhekinkosi Church of the Nazarene elders that while the prime minister continues to be a regular feature, they have been worried not seeing his wife by his side during services.

It was revealed that it has been two full months since the PM's wife last attended church at Bhekinkhosi. "Our questions were then answered by Aunt Lomagugu (PM's sister) who requested to see us as the elders after church. She revealed that they were holding talks with the Maziya family over the problems experienced by the couple while seeking prayer from the church to see them through it all.

We do not have all the answers at the moment, but are praying that the family manages to rise above their problems," said one of the church elders who asked not to be mentioned.

Another elder confirmed that the premier had personally asked the church to pray for his wife whom he said was sick about a month ago.

Couple

Efforts were made to get hold of the couple's spiritual leader Pastor Gladys Dlamini but were unsuccessful as she was reportedly out of the country following a trip she had taken to South Korea and was expected to return this weekend.

This newspapper can confirm that Maziya is back at her parental home in Nkamanzi in the Manzini region as also attested to by residents of the area as well her mother to the Swazi News last weekend. In an interview with the other newspaper, Maziya's mother said they were now worried by her continued stay at home instead of being with her husband. She is alleged to have told her mother that the PM asked her to visit home for some time.

PM's wife Joy literally ducks from the media

Fiforts by the Observer on Saturday to get a comment from the Joy Dlamini hit a snag.

Attempts to get the Director of Libraries to speak to us were first made on Wednesday when a call was put through to her secretary in Mbabane where an appointment with her was set.

The secretary promised to return the call and state when Maziya would be available, but until late on Thursday the call had not been returned and efforts to reach her again proved futile as workers appeared to have been engaged in the protest march by civil servants.

The last ditch effort to get hold of Maziya through her mobile phone was made and it eventually succeeded, but as soon as this reporter introduced himself to her and told her about the efforts to get an appointment with her, she cut off the conversation. She did not answer the follow-up calls.

In an interview with the Swazi News the PM is alleged to have stated that he did not entertain gossip.

Efforts to get Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane were futile throughout the week.

However, the strength to publish the story was derived from the fact that it has no malicious intent and was sourced from church elders.

Church still hopeful Pastor Joy will return

Iders at the Bhekinkosi Church of the Nazarene are still hoping that the prime minister's wife Joy will return to the congregation through their prayers.

he mass prayer that had been organised for Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini and his wife Joy to assist them get past their challenges at Hlatikulu in the Shiselweni region was cancelled at the eleventh hour.

This was after the 16 pastors who had been asked to lead the unprecedented prayer service developed cold feet and pulled out from the arrangement.

KaGwegwe Indvuna
Mfeneziyamthoba Magagula,
who was instrumental in organising the prayer, confirmed that the
service had been cancelled.
Magagula said the prayer was
meant for the PM and his wife
who according to him
(Magagula) was faced with challenges that needed divine intervention. When asked why it had

been cancelled Magagula said all the pastors from the 16 different churches that he had invited to the prayer said they were busy.

"Awukaphumeleli bafundisi batsite batabe babhizi kakhulu so ngeke usaba khona lomthandazo," he said. Magagula had announced the mass prayer in the Swazi News last weekend stating that they were concerned because the PM was the head of government. He had stated that as the organiser and a Swazi citizen he had noted with concern that the PM was always alone in public functions and reportedly informed by some members of the Maziya family that the PM's wife Pastor Joy was at home.

Magagula had planned to pitch a tent at the Hlatikulu bus rank so that all people could attend and members of the Jericho, the Zion churches, Roman Catholics and Nazarene churches were supposed to grace the prayer and all of them said they were too busy to make it to the event.



Amnesty slams SD on 'narrow' Sexual Offences Bill


mnesty International is concerned with the country's Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill that is still to be passed into law by the country's legislators.

In its latest report released this week, the global movement of more than seven million people who take injustice personally and are campaigning for a world where these rights are enjoyed by all, expressed concern about the safeguarding of the country's women's rights.

The organisation's main observation is that the original progressive draft has been diluted and the Bill now contains a narrow definition of rape and excluded marital rape, amongst other concerns.

"Despite high levels of gender-based violence, the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill had not been enacted by the end of the year (2015). The Bill had been under discussion by Parliament since 2006. The original progressive draft has been diluted and the Bill now contains a narrow definition of rape and excludes marital rape, among other concerns," reads the report in part.

Annesty International is a non-governmental organisation (NGO) founded in London on May 28, 1961, that seeks to publicise violations by governments and other entities of rights recognised in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (1948), especially freedom of speech and of conscience and the right against torture. It actively seeks the release of political prisoners and the relief, when necessary, of their families. It also works with intergovernmental human rights bodies to expand and enforce human rights protections in international law.


It is stated in the report that the police prevented members of the Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) from meeting in February and March resulting in the SNAT secretary general being assaulted by the police.

Attempt

The organisation states that this was during an attempt by TUCOSWA to hold a meeting at the SNAT offices in Manzini on March 14, last year.

It further reveals that after effectively being banned for over three years, TUCOSWA was finally registered by the ministry of labour and social security on May 12.

"Human rights defenders, political activists, religious leaders and trade union officials were threatened with violence by police, arrest or other forms of pressure as a consequence of their advocacy of human rights, respect for the rule of law or political reforms," further reads

the report.

Meanwhile, it was reported in the local media that Mhlanga lost one of his front teeth and suffered from painful private parts after the alleged scuffle with the police.

The incident allegedly happened when police officers stopped a meeting organised by TUCOSWA at the SNAT Centre in Manzini.

Mhlanga alleged to the media that he was dragged for about 20 metres, while about 15 police officers held him by his private parts.

"Upon return home from an international trip on Friday afternoon, I found that there would be a meeting of executive officials of TUCOSWA and the meeting was to be held at the SNAT

Centre.

As I approached the main gate to the venue of the meeting, I found a contingent of police officers, who were all over the gate. I walked inside and found other officials in the boardroom. While preparing to convene our meeting, the police came and ordered us out of the boardroom.

"They told us that we cannot proceed with the meeting. They then drove us out of the boardroom.

We moved out and got inside our bus and locked ourselves inside. While inside, police surrounded the bus. They then moved to the back of the SNAT bus and forcefully opened its back side.

That is when they grabbed me

and pulled me out of the vehicle," Mhlanga was quoted as having said.

"They then dragged me for about 20 metres from the bus before they started kicking me all over the body. While sprawled on the turf, someone kicked me in the mouth. I felt like there was sand in my mouth. All this happened outside the SNAT Centre premises on the road leading to Manzini Central High.

"When I tried to spit, blood and a white stone-like thing came out of my mouth. I then took it and discovered that it was one of my front teeth. Blood then oozed out and they left me lying on the ground," Mhlanga further alleged.

Security

He said the security guard who was manning the gate was allegedly forced by the police to hand over the keys to them. He said after that, other members of the executive decided to take him to hospital, where he was treated for bruises all over the body.

Following the reports, Police National Commissioner Isaac Mmemo Magagula later extended their apologies to SNAT for the confrontation they had with the organisation's executive. Magagula said while the police were executing their duties, excessive force might have been used, which sometimes happened in their line of duty.

A task team comprising of three men was then set up by the police to investigate the alleged harassment of Mhlanga and some of his colleagues.

Zavale's murder in police custody a concern - Amnesty

The unexplained death of Mozambican national Luciano Zavale in police custody continues to haunt the country's human rights record.

June, last year, has been included in the latest Amnesty International Report on Human Right Violations as one that remains a concern.

"Deaths in police custody under suspicious circumstances remained a concern in Swaziland. On June 12, a Mozambican national, Luciano Reginaldo Zavale, died in police custody after being arrested for possession

of a stolen laptop. Independent forensic evidence indicated that he did not die of natural causes. An inquest into his death started in September," reads the report.

The report further states that torture in police custody also persisted. It states that in March 2015, while in custody at Big Bend Prison, human rights lawyer Thulani Mascko was held in solitary confinement for three weeks as punishment for an alleged breach of prison rules.

"He had no access to legal counsel during the disciplinary proceedings and the length of his confinement can be regarded as a form of torture and other ill-treatment. PUDEMO President Mario Masuku was denied access to adequate and independent medical care for complications relating to diabetes throughout his 14 months in pre-trial detention at Zakhele Remand Centra and Matsahele Remand Central Prison," further reads the report.

On the death penalty, the report reveals that only one person remained under sentence of death. It says no death sentences were imposed during the year.

"Two death sentences were commuted to life imprisonment by the King".

Calls for legislative reform, respect for human rights in SD

mnesty International in its latest report has noted that the rule of law crisis that started in 2011 persisted, but took a new turn in April, last year, with the arrest of several judicial officers.

It noted that this resulted in the suspension and subsequent dismissal of then Chief Justice (CJ) Michael Ramodibedi, who is a Lesotho national, for "serious misbehaviour".

It states on April 17, 2015, the High Court issued an arrest warrant against Ramodibedi and High Court Judge Mpendulo Simelane on 23 charges brought by the Anti-Corruption Commission, including defeating the ends of justice and abuse of power.



Schoolboy in murder of solider is a hothead

ayiwane High School Form III pupil Linda Dlamini, who is awaiting trial after being arrested for the murder of soldier Bongani 'Yuki' Tsabedze, has a history of wayward behaviour in and outside school.

The 20-year-old boy was charged with the murder of Tsabedze and in the charge sheet brought before court recently, he was charged with murder in that on a Thursday, a fortnight ago and while at Ndlalambi area he stabbed the deceased with a sharp object all over the body resulting to his death. This was during a buganu binge in the area and Tsabedze, who was in his late 20's, was a soldier based at Nsingizini Barracks. Both the barracks and Ndlalambi area are located in Northern Hhohho region. Dlamini, on the other hand, is from Ludzibini Umphakatsi under Chief Magudzulela in the same area.

Information gathered by the Observer on Saturday can reveal that the young man, who is currently under police custody is a member of a feared local gang that is notorious and untouchable. Sources from the area and from the young man's school revealed to this publication that Dlamini was known as an untouchable

young man because once one touched him then they had invited the wrath of the gang.

It has been revealed that Linda, who frequented the area's drinking spots even during school days had a string of cases of misbehaviour at school that emanated from his drinking habits with his friends.

"He had the influence of a local notorious gang that is very rough. He was untouchable and even at school he had many cases of misbehaviour. Some of his cases at school were never reported by his peers for fear of further victimisation. Some time, last year, he found his sister chatting with another boy behind the classes and he beat him to a pulp. Such was not reported to the school's administration. Another case that was not reported to school was one where he physically assaulted a teacher from the school around his home area following a misunderstanding that had allegedly started at school," revealed our source.

Caught

Just last year it was also revealed that Linda was caught red handed by his teachers during their ballgames at the Prison sports ground in Pigg's Peak trying to purchase alcoholic beverages from the Correctional Services canteen disguising as a person permissible to purchase alcohol.

"That is one of the cases that he has been involved in at school. Some of his friends have already been dismissed from school after they were found drinking buganu and I am sure if he had been around he would have been part of them. At face value Linda can

fool you, but once you get close you know what you are faced with," added our source.

The Observer on Saturday team visited the school situated in the scorching heat of the Northern Hhohho region, but unfortunately the deputy principal found at the school said she knew nothing about the young man as she had just been transferred to the school. She instead referred us to the Principal Mr Mkhonta, who, however, could not be reached for comment at the time of compiling this report.

Meanwhile, the death of the soldier has torn the Ludzibini umphakatsi under Ndlalambi apart. It was also gathered by the Swazi Observer that it is not the first time a member of the Ludzibini Umphakatsi had been arrested for murder.

Culprits

One of the culprits, Nganono Dlamini, who was involved in the bloody fight that led to the death of the Nsingizini barracks soldier, was out of jail after he was found guilty by Principal Judge Stanley Maphalala in 2013 for burning to death Obadia Hlophe, who is a resident of the same area on December 5, 2003.

According to documents from the High Court of Swaziland, Nganono in the company of 12 others, accused Hlophe of witchcraft hence they wanted him to show them his muti and the pot, which he uses for it. It is said Hlophe (the deceased) was taken to a spot where he alleged that he was going to point out his muti. Along the way he was assaulted with sticks and was then taken to a spot where he was burnt using car tyres and paraffin.



CONSULTANT ANTICIPATED NEGATIVE

The consultant says it is acutely aware of the possibility of some negative public sentiment which may result from the extent of its remuneration recommendations contained in the report.

The consultant, however, says it strongly believes that it has a professional and moral duty to make remuneration recommendations which are fair and justifiable, and which are made without fear, favour or prejudice. And there has been no effort by a third party to attempt to influence the results and recommendations contained herein.

It says it has formed a strong view that public office bearer remuneration has not kept pace with economic

and other developments in the past. In addition, remuneration levels have not to date been determined in accordance with scientific methodologies. The consultant, therefore, set out to make recommendations which would, settle public office bearer remuneration at levels that would be fair, just and equitable, and at the same time reflect the value of public office and service to the country.

The common concept of analysing comparative data, adds the consultant, includes the determination of a mid-point as well as determination of the median. The mid-point method is commonly used where the salary ranges between comparator organisations are predetermined and agreed upon. The computation of the median is generally easier to understand and the government Circular No: 4

compute public/government companies according to the median concept. For uniformity, the consultant has then adopted the median concept for analysing the pay-scale compara-

HOW THE REMUNERATION REPORT WAS DONE

Ahead of review results and recommendations, the consultant has formulated a set of underlying principles it has utilised in exercising the discretion and responsibility conferred on it by government to make recommendations on the salaries, allowances and benefits of defined public office bearers. They are not a substitute for, but are rather drawn from requirements set by the terms of reference. They reflect the effort of the consultant to arrive at princi-

pled but practical bases for determining equitable remuneration. For some of the underlying considerations, the consultant is indebted to submissions proffered by stakeholders such as the executive, legislature, judiciary and various public service cadres. Other principles have emerged from the research and deliberations of the consultant.

Public office bearers are there to serve the people as such, the manner in which public office bearers are remunerated must not only be in accordance with the law but must also be open and justifiable. Whether the remuneration of public office bearers is appropriate hinges on several important factors. One that stands out is whether the different levels of remuneration are affordable in relation to available government

resources and public purse.

The remuneration package must be properly connected or related to the office bearer post. It must fit the purpose, duties, responsibilities, powers and activities attached to the position in the relevant institutions. The remuneration must be properly aligned to the relative rank or grading and status of the job in the state institution and must be assessed keeping in mind appropriate external comparators such as pay levels of comparable positions in public administration, organs of state, state, owned enterprises, non-governmental organisations, the private sector. foreign governments and public international institutions.

The consultant is obliged to take notice of market trends but this does not mean that public office bearer

rofessionals are leaving government for the better paying similar positions in the private, parastatals and non government organisations sector, where they receive on average 35.19% more compared to what government offers.

Furthermore, government faces the risk of high turnover in the health sector due to regional demand. The professional cadre within government is also non competitive.

The professional cadre was profiled and compared to the private sector and to emphasise the quality of the comparison, it became prudent for the consultant to name the companies, organisations and institutions that participated in this comparison and these included: Dan and Don Construction, Manyatsi Nhleko Consulting Engineers, Africa South Architects, ED Simelane Consulting Engineers, Red Cross Society, FLAS, NERCHA, MSF, Unitrans Logistics, Cargo Carriers, SEA, STA, SNTC, municipalities (Matsapha/Piggs Peak), SNPF Properties, PSPF, FINCORP, etc.

The approach to the analysis included grouping companies in the same sectors together (e.g. health providers), clustering similar positions and then analysing the payscales, determining their median and mean then comparing with those under government. Due to the fact that government ordinarily and expectedly had more positions in the same grade than others and at times, those positions being unique to gov-

ernment only, the band cluster approach was adopted in comparing the grades under the Upper and Lower only without sub-banding.

The report further states that the relevance of this comparison to those that have similar positions with government under this cadre is further enhanced by the fact that government has lost professionals to these organisations namely new parastatals, NGOs and UN agencies. As such the comparison is more meaningful as both government and the private sector pool resources from the same source.

The above comparative analysis table shows that there is consistency in the non competitiveness of the professional cadre within government. With the advent of free movement of labour as advocated by SADC, government is prone to have a higher labour turnover in the Health Sector due to the regional demand.

However, deeper analysis of the migration of professionals across country boundaries indicates availability of skilled resources from financially challenged economies such as Zimbabwe and Zambia albeit the fact that frequent changes in labour force eradicate knowledge




retention and institutional memory. In this regard therefore, taking into cognisance the revision of allowances that resulted in the abolishment recommendation of some, the proposed/recommended professional pay-scales should be competitive and closely aligned if not matched to those t of the public sec-

The above table (Fig.1) shows that government is currently remunerating at an average of 35.19% below the market median. As per the graph shown above, there are substantial gaps in the differentials computed with the highest being -74% against a high of +10.9%. In this instance therefore it will not be prudent of the consultant to recommend a flat rate of increase across all positions as such shall not be equitable taking into account the huge differences. At the same time, earlier analysis in some grades concluded that there are other factors that need attention and to be addressed in the recommendations including the following:

The deliberate attempt to accommodate pay-scales as much as possible to limit the incidence of red-circled positions.

The absorbing of higher earning



grades arising out of the compres-

sion of grades. Ensuring that government is pegged at a level where necessary skills can still be attracted from the labour pool.

Based on the afore-stated, the consultant confirmed the best approach to be that of rationalising the recommended increments factoring in the above stated.

This was done while consciously ensuring that the entire process remained transparent and indeed equitable, notwithstanding the negative impact arising out of the compression of grades which in the short term may be deemed inappropriate, as well as inconveniencing, yet this will rectify the deficiencies noted in earlier sections of this report which shall be addressed for good. It is envisaged that subsequent job evaluation and grading exercises shall focus mostly on newly established as well as newly graded positions with more inclination towards salary reviews vis a vis job evaluation.

RECOMMENDED PAY SCALE

The graph above (Fig.2) shows the comparison of current government remuneration in relation to the mar-

ket. It also shows the recommended increase per grade. The factors that influenced the proposed pay scale include:

- . The move toward normalising government remuneration structure.
- Reduction in distortions
- · Limiting the number of red circled positions.
- Affordability
- . Bridging the gap and not matching the computed market rates.

The following graph (Fig. 3) shows the proposed percentage increase per grade, that the lower grades A and B have the highest proposed increase margins while grade C has the lowest proposed increase in line with the market comparison findings.

It is important to analyse the difference in the remuneration of the anchor position, being the highest paid civil officer in this instance Secretary to Cabinet with that of the lowest paid civil servant.

As indicated by the graph, the gap has been reduced by 343% based on the proposed remuneration. This is synonymous and consistent with the compression of grades under the new proposed structure.

WHAT STAKEHOLDERS HAD TO SAY

the following input is a summary of submissions recorded through consultations held with stakeholders specified in annex-

• Special needs teachers' remuneration needs to be carefully considered, in cognisance of the extra individual attention each student needs which is not the case with regular teachers.

 The travelling claims for head teachers is capped at E800 and the submitted view is that this should be incorporated into the salary in the same manner with the overtime for

nurses, because as part of their functions, head teachers have to frequently travel to the TSC as well as other meetings.

• It has been noted that the responsibilities of teachers are now far beyond the normal calling of teachers in the traditional sense. Because of the advent of the HIV AIDS epidemic and teachers having to deal with child headed homes and children suffering from HIV induced opportunistic diseases and cognisance needs to be taken of this as these teachers are exposed to occupational trauma that

their training has not prepared them

 Teachers who are posted to rural schools-particularly those schools with no electricity, running water or proper sanitation, readily available public transport and are exposed to strenuous working conditions yet without hardship allowance.

• There are indications of potential exploitation in the conditions of service of contract teachers as it was noted that in some cases teachers had been on two year renewable contracts for over 15 years with no terminal benefits due to them by government.

The Swaziland Nurses

Association (SNA) submitted that the grading of nursing managers is not congruent with that of other managers within the civil service, yet their responsibilities are far more complex and require a higher level of technical skill e.g. skills required to perform certain lifesaving procedures can only be obtained through specialised training and experience.

 Senior nurses frequently have to assume the responsibilities of Nurse Managers operationally because of the inadequate number of nurse managers. There are senior nurses in the system but this is not reflected in the current structure. This has led to a

functional gap between the Nurse es. The senior nurses are expected to perform their normal day to day nursing functions, be responsible for shift management as well assisting junior nursing staff.

 Some allowances e.g. infectious disease allowance (E30/year) are no longer relevant to the market price.

• The remuneration for tertiary advancement critical to the performance and experience required to conduct complicated procedures in the absence of doctors is non-existent in the nursing cadre. This has also led to task shifting, where nurses are now

remuneration must be market related, in the sense that pay levels should be at the same level with what the private sector would pay. The subtext of this requirement is that market trends are beyond reproach. The consultant takes the view that whilst market trends are useful as part of a collection of comparators, it would be inappropriate to require public remuneration to be market driven. In fact, it may constitute a breach of a vital principle of public service to equate

what the market can bear on remuneration to what may be appropriate pay levels in the public sector. Like any responsible employer, government should have a remuneration system that is able to attract and retain skilled and competent staff. The immediate difficulty is that public office bearers are appointed in different ways and their tenures of office differ remarkably.

Ordinarily in the private sector remuneration is required to be performance driven. However, matters are different in the domain of public office bearer remuneration. Historically, in this country, office bearers in the same grade (or notch) are deemed to be equal and are normally entitled to the same pay level despite their manifest unequal performance. This entrenched notion of entitlement to equal remuneration seems to be intolerant to performance based remuneration. The constraint is embedded in the so-called principle of parity of precedence.

The consultant has sought to observe and advance equal treatment and uniformity of salaries, allowances and benefits for positions adjudged to entail equal work and responsibility. Also the Consultant must observe uniform norms and standards nationally. This principle is not beyond criticism. In fact, it is often at odds with recognising and rewarding good performance and experience. The consultant has been confronted with submissions that suggest that length of service supersedes qualification hence the latter should be remunerated lower. This is where job evaluation and grading is key in terms of levelling the playing field for easier allocation of remuneration. In this regard the consultant has no option but to observe parity of precedence by not seeking to differentiate the remuneration levels of posts in the same category through performance criteria. For the consultant's part this is not the last word on this matter. It remains important to explore appropriate means of enhancing the performance of public office bearers without limiting the proper fulfilment of duties imposed by law. It must be added that not all measured performance need be linked to financial reward. Quite often internal and external rating of performance and public disclosure of poor performance has a salutary

An analysis of the public (government) and private sector salaries indicated the imminent fact that Government's pay scale will always be lower than that of the private sector due to the fact that even if the review can result in an identical match to median, all things being equal the following factors shall always come into play:

The government structure of bene-

fits and allowances can never be compared to that of the private sector due to affordability.

Cost of living adjustments in the private sector tend to be above the inflation rate at an average of 1-2% above inflation as it is negotiated in a highly geared unionised environment, the basis of discussion being organisational profitability. This widens the pay scale gaps over time in between the next government review, a difference emanating from the cost of living adjustment.

The private sector is always diligent in commissioning reviews at 3 year intervals which at times are not undertaken by government due to financial challenges. Based on the aforestated, it must therefore be accepted that government will never match the private sector in remuneration as such it would be folly of the consultant to consider same. It must further be noted that labour mobility within the private sector is very high at a rate of 20% compared to near zero in government. This labour movement horizontally (in the same level but salary driven) and or vertically (career progression) continually increase organisation pay scales in the private sector.

Tete-a-tete with Ministry of Public Service

n September 8, an introductory meeting was held between the ministry of public service and the consultant LCC Capital.

The meeting was chaired by the Principal Secretary (PS) Mr. E Madlopha attended by all Heads of Departments (HODs) of the ministry and the consultant. The PS highlighted that the main objective of the review is to ensure that the systems in place for administration and distribution of salaries and benefits in the public service are applied appropriately and address the situation where there is some inefficiency. Below is the background summary of issues that compelled the ministry of the public service to engage the consultant to undertake the review process. The streamlining of the existing salary and grading structures will allow for reasonable and relatively consistent differences between grades and sub-grades (points). The review will further normalise the existing overlapping points in some grades which make it difficult to determine proper pay points. The anomalies which were identified in the previous exercise conducted by PE Consulting Group in 1998 will be addressed. The ministry of the public service has for some time experienced technical problems with the current Job Evaluation System. The system has challenges and some positions are still deemed as being inaccurately graded. Such weakness has destabilised reporting structures in some ministries and therefore caused inconveniences and dissatisfaction.

He noted that the last public service salaries review was undertaken ten years ago. The annual salary inflation adjustments have had little impact towards salary improvement due to the high cost of living, hence the need for review. The development of remuneration and benefits policy framework will guide in the administration of salaries allowances and benefits in different categories and public service in general. The policy framework will facilitate for the implementation of scarce skills in the Public Service. Presently there are no guidelines for the administration of salaries and benefits for some categories. For instance in the current salary review certain positions forfeited their previous benefits because they have been classified into a new category. The review will holistically address the inconsistencies to avoid the piece meal approach. The consultancy is expected to address the following: To the review the current salary and grading structures and make recommendations for improvement.

- To review the current job evaluation system equitability to determine whether its application is correct or there is a need for it to be replaced.
- To develop a remuneration and benefits framework for categories within the Public Service.
- To develop a strategy on attraction and retention of the scarce skills within the Public Service
- The expected outcomes of the review process are the following:
- To have a new or improved salary and job grading structures within the Public Service.
- To apply the new or improved job evaluation system within the Public Service.
- To have in place a remuneration and benefits policy framework for all categories of services within the public service.
- To have in place a strategy on attraction and retention of scarce skills in the public service

Meeting with the Director of Management Services Department

The Director of Management Services Department (MSD) indicated that in 2000 the Camphor Report was adopted this involved the incorporation of allowances into the grading/ evaluation. The evaluation of the Civil Service identified six categories .these being;

Professional

- Operational
- Technical
- Management
- Senior Management
- Clerical

This categorisation was carried out by Dupuis Consultants, however the challenge with this categorisation was that each category had a ceiling and once attained could not be passed. The decision was then taken that this ceiling should not thwart career development. The Camphor Report was then suspended as a recommendation from Secretary to Cabinet that there should be a compression of the category system. The system recommended was then in line with the philosophy that no category should be higher than the controlling officer. This created an anomaly that was manifested by the allowances given to certain positions/cadres as a retention strategy however this resulted in some cadre incumbents allowances being in excess of their basic salaries.

Rationalising why this was done through the categorisation of certain positions was considered to be a lesser catalyst towards addressing the anomalies than adopting the categorisation system in its entirety. The Hybrid System of Patterson & Hay was adopted to implement the compression of the categories, however this had a negative effect on the remuneration structure, because of the distortions caused by the

allowances that are structured into the remuneration of the cadre privileged by this and the compression of the category structures. The 2004 review was supposed to address the retention allowance into a more equitable compensation system with regards to job content because the system had been adulterated to pay certain people more.

The wage bill is not commensurate with the actual salaries that are paid and this distorts the entire government expenditure and salaries because of the allowances paid.

The categorisation does not take into account the professional expertise and decision making of the different jobs nor does it address the compensation policy of Government to ensure that the anomalies raised by the non-implementation of the past surveys done are corrected.

This is further evidenced by the different Ministerial HR positions which are all compensated at the same rate despite the different complexities of the various HR functions and responsibilities within the different ministries.

The Fire-fighters are demanding an increase in allowances to a standardised system to circumvent the government paying overtime, whether overtime has been worked or not.

This makes certain jobs to be paid allowances they don't deserve without any benefit to the employer.

doing work that should actually be done by doctors.

- Schemes of Service for the accounting and stores cadres have been developed however these are viewed as contentious by the SNA-GAP in that they seem to favour inexperienced young graduates at the expense of experienced, long serving accountants.
- The tasks within the CSC
 Secretariat are multi-faceted and there are numerous functional overlaps within various jobs. There is a high prevalence of one performing functions that are not in their job description just to get the job done. The job descriptions are generic taken from
- other departments and are not congruent with the tasks done within the CSC resulting in the purported functional overlaps.
- Challenges faced by the Secretariat of the Teaching Service Commission are wide and varied, from hiring and managing the entire teaching service value chain such as curriculum development, promotion, skills development, discipline etc. There needs to be a thorough analysis of the secretariat in comparison to other Consultants because the TSC is the management services department of the entire teacher cadre and they feel that due recognition is not expressed as assigned grades are low.
- There are instances where Legal Advisors are seconded to various ministries in management function yet without capacity for example in legal drafting and other legal managerial functions. Over and above this, all documents with legal ramifications have to be vetted by the AG's office which causes duplication.
- Magistrates are pegged at the same grade as the Crown Counsels yet the requisite experience for a Magistrate is five years in practice while that of a Crown Counsel is only a year post completion of articles. The tasks and responsibilities of the magistrate are far more challenging and decisions they have to take are
- very significant and impact on lives of citizens and the integrity of the judicial system.
- Judicial Secretaries over and above their daily functions have to frequently respond to urgent applications after hours and at times on weekends. The work doubles during Supreme Court sessions yet there is no compensation.
- Promotion in the specialised jobs can take up to 20 years depending on the exiting of the incumbent in the job above, this effectively has led to frustration, complacency and poor performance on the part of the individuals who are not promoted.
- Most HRO's investigate and initi-
- ate disciplinary proceedings in the process grossly undermining their impartiality as dustodians of the "Good Labour Practice" process. In practice all disciplinary proceedings are supposed to be initiated by the manager of the employee that has committed an offence. The effect of this is that HRO therefore fell that they do more as such should be compensated accordingly.
- The Parliamentary Services job descriptions and the remuneration of these professionals also need to be reviewed in light of the operational changes that have taken place.

FAO RAINS E3.5M on LOCAL FARMERS

he Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) has provided US\$240 000 (about E3 667 268) to a total of 100 local farmers to pilot an agricultural project to grow fruits and vegetables around four project areas or RDAs.


The project is being piloted in the four Rural Development Areas (RDAs) around the country and FAO has roped in the National Marketing Board (NAMBOARD) as a partner to work closely with the identified famers to source market locally and abroad.

The main aim of the project is to introduce and emphasise on the importance of intercropping of fruit trees and vegetables to maximise space in fields.

This was confirmed by FAO Conservation Agriculture Specialist Ndumiso Masimula, who told the Observer on Saturday that the project will take the climate smart agriculture approach.

"This project emphasises on intercropping of the fruit trees and vegetables. What happens is that when fruit trees such as mango trees are planted farmers leave spaces of about 8 metres between them, which is a huge space that can be utilised for other things.

"We therefore emphasise on planting vegetables between these trees on their initial stages because once these trees have overgrown they tend to overshadow the small vegetable plants. It is therefore essential that the space in between ...Pilot project adopts climate smart agricultural approach and includes 100 farmers that will be assisted by NAMBOARD to ensure availability of market locally and abroad

the trees is utilised," explained Masimula.

Masimula added that once they felt that the project was progressing well, they planned to expand to even other areas. Already the farmers have been extensively trained by the FAO to undertake the project and will also get adequate assistance from the organisation as the

project continues.

The Observer on Saturday team visited one of the farmers involved in the project at Timbutini in the Manzini region.

The farmer Roman Dlamini expressed his excitement at being one of the people to be involved especially at this pilot stage of the project. He took the team around his fields and showed that he had prepared a hectare of his land for the project.

"Everything pertaining to the

planting and digging of holes for the seeds has come with specific instructions. The plan for me is to intercrop the mango trees with pawpaw trees and everything has been approved.

"The instruction was that I prepare all the holes according to the specifications of 8m apart and then I will be provided with the garden ready plants. It is expected that in two years I will start harvesting the fruits and in the meantime I will be cutting off the flowers to stop the

trees from producing the fruits until the stems are strong enough to withstand the weight of the fruits," disclosed Dlamini.

In case the ongoing drought as exacerbated by the El Nino phenomenon persists, Dlamini has a nearby dam to assist him water his plants so that they produce the best fruits

The dam was constructed for the Timbutini Community by the land development department under the ministry of agriculture.

High costs, pig farmers must produce own feed

ith the country and region experiencing its worst drought in many years, reality has crept in that the country is experiencing a total crop failure, particularly with regard to grains hence the increase in animal feed prices.

The demand for animal feed has increased as the drought conditions in the country worsened and in addition to that, the price increase of commodities and raw material has worsened the plight of farmers, driven by the exchange rate and late plantings of maize in North America. This, therefore, has forced trends in animal feed prices upward.

The explanation is that South African markets on all feed commodities shot up due to the increase in international commodity prices and the deterioration of the South African rand.

The South African harvest of feed commodities is in balance with demand, except white maize for human consumption. The South African price of yellow maize has fluctuated slightly during the last year and due to the increase in import parities in the USA and

Argentinean markets, yellow maize prices increased in South Africa.

This means, therefore, that the country's renowned suppliers of animal feed, just like their equals in the region, have been forced to increase their prices of animal feed. Animal feed for the raising of pigs is very essential and therefore Roman Dlamini says he has answers for local farmers in cushioning the escalating feed prices.


Dlamini said it was crucial that local farmers learn to mix the feed on their own instead of relying on established to supply them. He told this

publication he could share his knowledge for mixing the feed with other farmers so that they can operate their piggeries at minimal costs.

He named the main ingredients in the pig feed as yellow maize and sunflower, which farmers can grow on their own. He said other ingredients included certain concentrates, which they can then purchase.

"I am ready to assist any farmer in mixing the animal feed as I learnt that a long time ago. It is very easy as opposed to having to purchase at high prices from suppliers," added Dlamini

Sheriff turned farmer reveals how butcheries cheat pig farmers

imbutini based Roman Dlamini, who is a former Deputy Sheriff turned farmer has revealed how he decided to take time off his piggery project after realising that he was benefitting far less than what was due to him due to exploitation of pig farmers by butchery owners.

Dlamini is a retired Deputy Sheriff under the Manzini region. He disclosed in an interview with the Observer on Saturday that while farmers should be the ones benefitting the most from the piggeries they operate, but it is butcheries that are making the most profits from an arrangement where the farmers raise the pigs and then sell the carcasses to various butcheries for retail around the

Independent investigations by this publication found that a kilogram of pork retailed at around E60 to E70 in various butcheries yet they purchased the carcasses

from the piggery owners at around E30 per kilogram.

Dlamini said he decided to stop the project and concentrate on other things when the butcheries would pay him E22 or E23 per kilogram and proceed to sell the pork at double the price.

"The Swazi farmer is actually the one suffering in this arrangement as raising the pigs until consumption time digs deep into their pockets yet a butcher who has not in any stage been involved in the process comes in to reap the most

It is an arduous process preparing the pig mother to give birth, raise the piglet to fully grown size until then time of selling," argued Dlamini.

The farmer said when he revives his piggery he will make sure that he supplies the pork to the consumer directly to avoid being cheated by the butcheries.


oman Dlamini has advised that there is absolutely life in farming after employment as he now boasts of a number of farming projects within his homestead at Timbutini.

He has been left to rue the missed chances in agricultural projects while pursuing his career as a Deputy Sheriff based in Manzini over the years until he retired in

As part of his various projects is a fish pond that he is developing as he states that he wants to take advantage of the vastly available fish market in the country. He said he wanted to grow talapin fish, which are the most common in the country.

Dlamini's other projects include the raring of indigenous chickens, which he then sells at over E300 per chicken depending on the breed. He raises at least 500 at a time in seven sheds.

Still on the chickens, Dlamini also has layers that produce at least 100 eggs a day and he in turn sells them to local residents. He also grows vegetables that range from beetroot, carrots, beans and many others.

The international organisation will assist the student with finances for medical check-ups in South Africa's hospitals and with criminal or civil cases that she may wish to pursue following the incident.

Amnesty International, commonly known as Amnesty or AI, is a non-governmental organisation focused on human rights with over seven million members and supporters around the world.

Their objective is "to conduct research and generate action to prevent and end grave abuses of human rights, and to demand justice for

those whose rights have been violated

UNISWA Student Representative Council (SRC) President Brian Sangweni confirmed that the Swaziland National Union of Students (SNUS) has engaged the international organisation.

"As the SRC we wish to report that SNUS has engaged Amnesty International who has agreed to assist in financing Ayanda's medical checkups in South Africa's hospitals and or assist with criminal or civil cases that she may wish to pursue. SNUS has as well arranged that we get Lawyers for Human Rights to accompany us to meet Ayanda's family, something which we wish to do over the weekend. We welcome the support of SNUS unreservedly and we appeal

that organisations and individuals do the same to support our colleague," said Sangweni.

Meanwhile, there was a violent clash between students and security forces during a protest on Monday night at the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) which led to the student being run over by the Operational Support Services Unit (OSSU) casspir.

Alleged

Students at the Kwaluseni campus alleged that the casspir drove at high speed into a group of about 2 000 students, who, when they realised that the vehicle was not stopping, ran in all directions.

The affected student was rushed to the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital and is now currently recuperating at the Manzini Clinic where she was transferred.

She allegedly suffered severe injuries, including a broken spinal cord, fractured ribs and further injuries to the body, face and legs. When asked what transpired on Monday night, she could not remember anything except that she was among the students who were protesting on the night.

Sangweni confirmed that the horific incident occurred at the graduation arena at about 9pm, on Monday.

El Nino causing global food crises, UN warns

evere droughts and floods triggered by one of the strongest El Niño weather events ever recorded have left nearly 100 million people in Southern Africa, Asia and Latin. America facing food and water shortages and vulnerable to diseases including Zika, the United Nations has said.

New figures from the UN's World Food Programme state that 40 million people in rural areas and nine million in urban areas who live in the drought-affected parts of Zimbabwe, Mozambique, South Africa, Zambia, Malawi and Swaziland will need food assistance in the next year.

Almost one million children are in need of treatment for severe acute malnutrition in eastern and Southern Africa.

Drought

Two years of erratic rain and drought have combined with one of the most powerful El Niño events in 50 years to wreak havoc on the lives of the most vulnerable children.

This is contained in the latest report by the UN agencies working within the affected Southern African region including Swaziland issued on Wednesday.

According to Leila Gharagozloo-Pakkala, Southern Africa Regional Director of the UN children's agency, UNICEF, governments are responding with available resources, but this is an unprecedented situation.

"The situation is aggravated by rising food prices, forcing families to implement drastic coping mechanisms such as skipping meals and selling off assets," the director said.

In a joint statement, the UN's Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) and the Famine Early Warning Systems Network, they said El Niño would have a devastating effect on Southern Africa's harvests and food security in 2016. The current rainfall season has so far been the driest in the last 35 years.

Even if it were to start raining today, the planting window for cereals has already closed in the Southern part of Africa and is fast closing elsewhere.

Prices

There has been a steep rise in market prices of imported staple goods. This is restricting access to food for the most vulnerable.

Already the impact is being felt in the kingdom as some Swazis are now forced to buy maize meal from neighbouring South Africa due to serious hike in mealie meal prices. Mozambique, Swaziland and other Southern African countries, face a disaster if the rains do not come within a few weeks, and the price of food will rise dramatically.

Swaziland has already declared the situation a national emergency and Zimbabwe, which also declared same this month, has seen harvests devastated and food prices soar, according to the Work Food Programme.

It reports that food production has halved compared to last year and maize is 53% more expensive with expiations of a need of nearly \$1.6bn in aid to help pay for grain and other food after the drought.

School without principal for a month, grounded

Since schools opened for the first term, Fonteyn High School has been operating without a principal and this has resulted in its operations grounded.

According to the school committee, purchase of stationery and other school needs have been grounded since the principal was taken away from them, leaving them with no one to run the school.

Despite that they have been promised that another principal will be brought to the school, the committee said they wanted nothing but their transferred Principal Buyile Simelane. They are now planning to seek audience with the Ministry of Education's Principal Secretary Pat Muir. "Since schools opened we have no head teacher because we were only informed about her transfer

about two weeks ago and operations at the school have been grounded," the concerned committee members said. They were not prepared for a new principal but only wanted Simelane back. Simelane has been hailed as having taken the school from zero to hero since it has been attaining a 100% pass rate since she took over as head and had good plans for the future.

MASTER INTERVENES IN WIDOW, STEPSON FEUD

he Master of the High Court has been forced to intervene in an intense feud over a homestead at Sidwashini in Mbabane involving a man (35) and his step mother as the latter and his biological children want to dispose of the homestead without the approval of the former.

The homestead in question is situated at Dark City in Sidwashini.

The Master of the High Court has since summoned both affected to his offices to try and get to the bottom of the matter. This is after the 35-year -old Sifiso Ronnie Nkambule wrote to the Master to request intervention into the dispute with his family over the property belonging to his late father.

He said he had been subjected to difficulties and torture by his other family members that include his stepmother and siblings in recent weeks.


Torture

He said part of the torture include him being locked out of the house for about five days by one of his siblings and that this forced him to stay in the streets and further seek help from his friends to accord him accommodation for his daughter and girl-friend. He reported the matter to the police and sought assistance from his lawyer to get the house reopened.

"Kindly note that this issue is already in your office after the other shareholders in the estate of my father are proposing that the property situated at Dark City in Mbabane be either sold or rented out as a matter of urgency.

I also want to bring to your attention that I have enlisted the services of a lawyer to handle this issue on my behalf as one of the shareholders in my father's estate," reads part of the letter directed the Master of the High

that he strongly objected to the plans by his other family members to sell the property for the simple reason that it is not being done in good faith and that the manner in which it is done raises suspicions that the intention is to ensure that he lives a miserable life.

"To put you in the light, I am the only surviving son of my late father's marriage to his first wife Lungile Dlamini, who has also passed away along with my sister Wendy.

Marriage

In essence, this means there were the only two of us born out of my father's first marriage, but I am now the only survivor.

After problems in his first marriage to my biological father, my father then entered into the second marriage with his now remaining wife Happy Hilder Nkambule (nee Simelane). I spent the better part of my teenage years living under the same roof with my father's new wife at the property now dispute. Four children were born out of this marriage including two boys

(Welile and Thami) and two girls (Sindi and Lethokuhle). Please note that these children are all younger than me because I am the oldest surviving son of my father, which means they all grew under my care and found me living in the same property now in dispute, I am trying to illustrate the point that Happy Simelane is not my mother," further reads the letter.

Nkambule also claims that he has been made to live an uncomfortable and risky life as strange people have been coming in and out of the house almost at free will using keys given to them by Welile.

He said some people had been coming to view the house as it was advertised in local newspapers as one that is for sale while others came as agents hired to sell the property.

"This also surprised me because everybody including your office must be well aware that I am still staying in that property, which means it is disrespectful for strangers to easily gain access to the house especially because I

have my child and girlfriend staying in my room. It brings trauma when you are confronted by uninvited guests in the house you grew up calling your home. This is also unlawful because I have not consented to the sale of the house and, therefore, do not expect buyers to view the property," Nkambule told the Master of the High Court.

Reiterated

Nkambule reiterated in the letter that he has no intention of selling the house and that he would rather die there than allow people to enrich themselves out of his father's hard work. He said he had no other place to stay and is currently his four week old daughter, who needs a decent place to grow and not a rented flat.

He further alleged that his stepmother was now offering him peanuts as compensation for the sale of the house which he said could not even sustain him for three days. He said he was currently unemployed and depended on casual jobs to put food on the table.

'My late father built own homestead for step mother'

In his argument to the Master of the High Court, Sifiso Ronnie Nkambule has noted that his stepmother has no say in the house in dispute especially because his father built another homestead for his stepmother that he specifically said she would stay in at Sigangeni.

Sigangeni is situated in the outskirts of Mbabane and past Motshane.

Nkambule told the Master of the High Court that what pained him the most was the fact that he personally built the house at Sigangeni on the instruction of his father who told him that it was going to be home to his stepmother and her children as it is the case now. "My father also indicated that the property in Mbabane was going to remain in the care of myself and my late sister born out of the first marriage. This does not mean that my other stepbrothers and sisters are not invited to this property and to prove that, I have been staying with Welile, who is the eldest son of my stepmother for some time in the same property. Let me also mention Lindokuhle, who is my late sister's son. He also needs a place he can call home and that place is where his mother was born and raised. He is currently living in Sigangeni not out of his free will, but because he was ordered to go there," he said. He added that basically the property that his stepmother and her children want to forcefully sell v out his consent is what he can call his home. He said it was the only place where he could raise his children as per the wishes of his deceased parents.

Unhappy with evaluation of house by stepmom

n another note, Sifiso Nkambule is not happy with the evaluation of the property in Mbabane that has been done by his stepmother.

He requested the Master of the High Court to not only stop the sale of the property, but also investigate the processes that had already been done by his stepmother to see the sale through. He said he had no doubt that there were underhand tactics being employed in the sale of the property and that he was currently arranging for an evaluator to come and evaluate the house to dispute the evaluations of the property brought forward by his stepmother. "I am currently arranging for another evaluator for the house because I do not trust what has been brought to your office by my stepmother given the glaring inconsistencies in the value of the property. She has already produced four different evaluations that surprisingly reflect that the value of the property is going down instead of going up as it is normally the case with most properties. This on its own raises suspicions hence I want another evaluator to do the process on my behalf," he said. He has also questioned the evaluation of a car that also belonged to his late father as he is surprised that the car that was valued at E27 000 two years ago has been presented to have gone down to a mere E6 000.

Nigeria church collapse, two children sue TB Joshua for E9m

wo South African children are suing Nigerian mega preacher TB Joshua's church after their father died in the collapse of a church guesthouse in Lagos in 2014.

These are the attest news on the church collapse in which two Swazi

nationals both women, were also killed as they had gone for the church's popular services.

News

The first Swazi was confirmed dead by local pastor Thulani Dlamini, who went to Nigeria immediately after the breaking news of the collapsed building were made headlines worldwide.

It was after a week following the

incident that another Swazi was confirmed dead and her family said she had actually had second thoughts about going to the synagogue but was persuaded by her friend little did she know that shewas flying to her death,

The popular pastor has a large following in the Kingdom, as a large number of Swazis normally travel to that country to get their hands on his famous 'holy water' and for miracles, while a local church has been formed. At least 115 people mostly South Africans, were killed on September 12, 2014 when a guesthouse belonging to Joshua's Synagogue Church of All Nations (SCOAN) fell apart. Joshua, one of Africa's wealthiest preachers, maintains that the collapse was caused by a mysterious aircraft.

Woman dumps toddler on Umgcugcuteli's lap, disappears

- She left baby as if attending to an errand in the city centre and that was the last she was seen
- Umgcugcuteli has been left with the burden of raising toddler

Community Motivator (Umgcugcuteli) has been left with a toddler on her lap after the mother disappeared without trace.

The woman who has been wanted for the past three months is said to have left the toddler, posing as someone who was going to the city centre toan errand and disappeared without trace.

So serious is the situation that Umgcugcuteli Lomthantazo Mwelase of Makholweni area has since sought the intervention of the police since she no longer knows what to do as she has nothing to feed the baby with, a struggle she has been enduring for months.

In an interview with Mwelase, she said the woman, Philsiwe Shongwe (22) left her twoyear, old son on her lap as she requested that she wanted to do some errands in the city centre, promising that she would be back within an hour.

However after an hour Mwelase said she had no problems as she knew that Shongwe might have been held up somewhere since there were so many things that could delay one in town.

She, however, became worried when the day came to a close as it became dark and she wondered what might have happened to her since the toddler was in turn registering his complaints by crying.

It was not until the following day that she seriously became worried as it also passed without Shongwe being seen and this time, she asked community police and other relatives to help her find the woman who had now disappeared.

Reported

The first, and second months elapsed and that is when the matter was reported to the local police post in Manzini North, where a missing person enquiry was opened but to date Shongwe has still not surfaced and the toddler still remains at the hands of the community motivator.

"I can no longer even perform my duties as umgcugcuteli as I have to look after the toddler, feed him from the nothing I have, which is really frustrating me," Mwelase said.

She appealed to anyone who might have knowledge of the woman's whereabouts to tell her to get her child.

Aged 22, the woman is said to have been last spotted in one of the townships near the city but again disappeared without trace.

Why women abandon their babies

ome women's rights groups argue that the rising number of abandoned babies are a symptom of gender inequality in this traditional society.

A baby was once wrapped in a blanket left by an unknown person on the white line separating the lanes of a highway entering Manzini, the baby was scooped by a motorist before he could be run over, and later taken to hospital.

In another incident the excitement of scavengers at the municipal dump at the Matsapha Industrial Site outside Manzini turned to horror when a plastic bag they at first thought contained meat, proved to be the burial shroud for a baby's corpse.

It has been gathered by some researchers that baby abandonment happens because adoption and abortion are frowned upon in certain cultures.

Young pregnant women are lead to believe that neither adoption nor abortion is a viable option for them although it is not clear to which cultures they are refer-

Poverty and alcohol along with substance abuse were the reasons suggested by some researchers whike believing that HIV/Aids is the reason behind baby abandonment, as half of abandoned babies are born to HIVpositive mothers. Gender inequality is a cause behind baby abandonment, according to a South African report as men or boys make babies and then walk away, leaving the responsibility of raising the child to the mother. An inability to communicate with family members and a feeling of being overwhelmed by the pregnancy was the reason offered by some who felt that young mothers are left by the father of their children as well as their community.

It has also been gathered that baby abandonment might be an extreme form of the maternal instinct, Some young mothers feel the baby would be better off without them and place their babies in a spot where they intend them to be discovered.



'Invoke *licala kaliboli* on flight investors who kill biodiversity'


nvironmentalist developing regulations of the Biodiversity Act to accommodate genetically modified crops want investors who destroy the environment or biodiversity then escape the country only to return under different names held accountable by removing the corporate veil.

A participant wanted the siSwati saying put into good use that *licala kaliboli* (a crime does not disappear until the necessary sanction goes through) and that *ingalo yemtsetfo yindze* (long arm of the law) which could be employed to haul before justice killers of the environment. The meeting was, however, grapping on two main approaches whether to adopt strict or fault based liability regime in enacting the regulations to the law.

Damage

There was also the legal view that once a person was dead no one carried their burdens. However some transnational corporations may have long gone when the damage to the environment is discovered and would be operating in jurisdictions outside those of Swaziland, therefore, making it exceptionally more expensive to institute degal processes.

In most cases the best option would be to simply rehabilitate the damaged environment. One such example that came to the fore was that of Bulembu Havelock Mine whereby government was left with a huge compensation bill long after the investor had left the country, leaving behind the environmental

hazard that left many miners and families approaching the courts for redress. However, environmentalists are worried about the long term effects of the hazards to the environment and its people.

Case

The problem was taken further as to what happens if the investor or operator in terms of the law returns into the country only to find government had rehabilitated the damage and causes more damage. Participants also wanted to know what would happen in the event the head of a family leaves behind GMO seed which is later planted by his children, resulting in damage would in this case be an operator.

This transpired at Sibane Hotel on Tuesday during a validation workshop commissioned by the Swaziland Environmental Authority and the United Nations Environment Programme. in products of modern biotechnology that can also stimulate a national economic growth.

Swaziland is a party to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety, having acceded to this international instrument in 2006. The first committal activity for the country to implement its obligations under the Protocol was to develop and adopt a Biosafety Framework which included a policy and legislation.

Health

The central standard of the Protocol is the precautionary approach which allows states to take regulatory measures even when there is no certainty of the harm occurring.

Whilst encouraging that standard, the Protocol recognises that modern biotechnology has a great potential for human well-being if developed and used with adequate safety measures for the environment and human health.

The country has a vision to be in the top 10% of the medium human development group of countries founded on sustainable development, social justice and political stability by the year 2022. The National Biotechnology Policy affirms this national vision and states that biotechnology is one of a number of technologies that can contribute towards achievement of these objectives.

These supportive national goals have to take on board the overarching environmental interest to ensure that developmental activities, including the handling and use of GMOs do not result in adverse effects to the environment and human health, underlying the prin-

ciple of sustainable development. This means there is need to put in place safeguards to minimise adverse effects that may result from developmental activities. The country is currently in a process of enhancing the regulation of GMOs by defining the appropriate liability and redress regime that may be adopted on cases of damage caused by genetically modified organisms (GMOs). It should be stated from the onset that issues of liability and redress often greatly influence the regulation of genetically engineered crops and present unique challenges to the adoption of the technology including investment, particularly in developing countries. Liabilty

Despite the above, defining a liability and redress regime is still important as it assures certainty for all other partners on the expectation of the country on operators, including end users such as farmers and consumers.

Whether a country commercialises biotechnology crops or benefits from their commercialisation, it is crucial that its legal framework defines a liability regime in the subject. A liability and redress regime also provides a way of dealing with scientific uncertainty by giving rights to injured parties to charge those responsible for causing harm and imposing an obligation on others to limit risks, mitigate losses and provides redress (Wan Talaat et al 2011). As the country is developing the liability and redress regime, there is need to observe and balance the competing interests under the use of GMOs.

These interests include the need to protect the environment and public health on one hand, and, on the other, the need to protect the interest of the public and industry by not stifling innovation or driving away investors in biotechnology or trade in products of modern biotechnology that can also stimulate a national economic growth.

During the debate this week, environmentalists noted that generally companies took necessary precautions for their own preservation on matters of making sure their products do not damage the environment.

The participants also wanted to know why investors felt uncomfortable if governments enacted strict laws to protect the environment if they would be bringing a harmless product.

A professor who forms part of the negotiating team on behalf of government said when they interacted with investors in the strict liability regime telling them they could be found liable as a developer and that



the fault based regime the developer is found liable conceded scientific proof they agreed that they anticitipated damage at the end of the lien because every product has the potential or element of risk to cause damage. "Even the cars we drive today have varying degrees of risk with some of lower risk. They are aware that there came with damages."

The consultant, however, suggested that the regulations should include a precautionary principle. "We are not trading off to a zero, there are other legislations e.g the

environmental law clusters and the common law, other laws assist common to zero-in. We have a cluster of environmental laws and therefore don't have a vacuum and cannot perpetually go undecided on whether we adopt strict liability or fault based liability. It is the liability section of the Biodiversity Act that is cause for concern to most investors and there is need for the competent authority to engage with such stakeholders to agree on an acceptable wording to suit both the regulator and the regulated community."

rowning is a serious leading cause of death amongst children, including infants and toddlers, the country has experienced.

Most infant drowning cases usually occur in bathtubs and buckets and toddlers between the ages of one and four years most commonly drown in swimming pools.

However, many children above this age frown in ponds, rivers, lakes and dams, but these varies from the area of the kingdom and it should be noted that children can drown below an inch of water.

With the country experiencing high temperatures as a result of the current drought situation, most people, especially children, opt to cool off by taking a dive into rivers and dams, and at times ponds where they normally swim.

This is not only done by children, but also the youth and adults who take their time to dip themselves in rivers across the country in a bid to cool themselves off which has seen both children and adults killed while swimming.

Accidents

Followings these incidences, the Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSP), has expressed its serious worry and concern over the increased number of deaths as a result of swimming expeditions countrywide and have decided to make a call to members of the public to avoid similar incidents.

This week Chief Police Information and Communications Officer (CPICO) Superintendent-Khulani Mamba said as a police service, they have noted with concern the increased number of death due to drowning since about four cases were reported within a space of a month, which is so shocking a statistic that they decided to warn members of the public about such.

According to Superintendent Mamba, one life is one too many hence they are taking the issue of drowning seriously since statistics have shown that the numbers are increasing at an alarming rate.

Concern

"Since the pupil is both a responsibility of the parent and teacher, we appeal to these to make sure they lecture the children about the dangers of swimming and supervise them in the event they use swimming pools," Mamba said.

He said painful as it may, they noted with concern the recent case of a child who drowned while cooling himself in a swimming pool at a hotel in Ezulwini, an incident that shows that the children should at least be under adult supervision.

At least four drowning cases according to Mamba have been reported and attended to by the police for the month of February 2016 alone, which is indeed a serious cause for concern.

Mamba said although in most intances, drowning cases involved children, adults had also not been left out as there are cases of those who drown while swimming, performing rituals or at times crossing flooded rivers, stating that they should always take the necessary precautions each times they use rivers, dams or swimming pools

At least 10 children drowned in the country during the month of January, resulting in police scuba divers carrying out searches for bodies for periods ranging from two to five days according to the police.

The victims were aged between nine and 16 years, with the last cases in January being those of two giris aged 13 who drowned together on January 25 with their HIIII

- · Get your child out of the water immediately, then check to see if she is breathing on her own. If she is not, begin CPR immediately.

- Concentrate instead on giving her rescue breathing and CPR until she is breathing on her own. Vomiting of swallowed water is very likely during CPR.
- Only when the child's breathing has resumed should you stop and seek emergency help call 977, once the paramedics arrive, they will administer oxygen and continue CPR if necessary.

Medical exam needed for any child close to drowning

Any child who has come close to drowning should be given a complete medical examination, even if she seems all right. If she stopped breathing, inhaled water, or lost consciousness, she should remain under medical observation for at least twenty-four hours to be sure there is no damage to her respiratory or nervous system.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS OFFERS VIABLE ALTERNATIVES TO INCARCER


ommunity Corrections offers viable alternatives to incarceration for offenders at various stages of the criminal justice system process. It offers offenders the rare opportunity of spending the remainder of their sentences in the community.


It has more advantages to both offenders and the state/government. Offenders sentenced to community corrections orders have the liberty to live with their families and do not require government resources such as food, water, electricity, shelter, clothes and medical services for survival as it is the case with offenders serving custodial sentences. This sentencing option saves government on prison operation cost, reduces prison overcrowding, spread of communicable diseases, inmates violence cases as well as minimising security threats within prison settings. Furthermore inmates released on community corrections sanctions are less likely to suffer from stigma associated with imprisonment while those serving custodial sentences often suffer rejection by society upon release. Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase says offenders who fail to reintegrate with their communities are more likely to relapse to crime, causing a huge burden to correctional efforts as a result of the increasing figures of recidivists. Serving sentence under community corrections orders enhances rehabilitation opportunities for many offenders as it places the community in a better position to observe and appreciate the offender's behaviour and attitude while serving his/her sentence in the community neighbourhood. In essence it makes the community feel part and parcel of the correction process of people in conflict with the law.

Community Corrections is defined as the supervision of criminal offenders in resident populations. Instead of imposing a sentence of imprisonment, courts may make community service orders, directing the clients to perform unpaid community service work for a specific number of hours. There are three main types of Community Corrections supervision or sentence options namely Parole, Probation and Community Service provides

Parole

Parole sentencing provides conditional release of offenders from prison to serve the remaining portion of their sentence in the community. Inmates may be released through successful application to the Parole Board.

Ntshangase explains that Parolees (offenders released on parole) are required to fulfil certain conditions and adhere to specific rules of conduct while in the community. Failure to comply with any of the conditions can result to the parole order being rescinded and replaced by a custodial sentence. Parolees can have a number of different supervision statuses including active supervision



could be due to a number of reasons. For instance, some may receive a reduction in supervision, possibly due to compliance or meeting all required conditions before the parole sentence terminates, and therefore may be moved from an active to inactive status.

Probation

Probation refers to adult offenders whom courts place on supervision in the community through a probation agency in lieu of incarceration. Just like parolees, probationers can have a number of different supervision statuses including active supervision. Some probationers may be placed on inactive status immediately because the severity

of the offence was minimal or some may receive a reducmove them from an active to instances, while on probation, offenders are required to fulfil supervision such

grammes and adhere to specific rules of conduct while in the community. The offender is supervised in the community and must follow the set of conditions and rules set out in his/her probation order. Conditions of probation include keeping the peace, being of good behaviour and obeying the law and reporting regularly to a probation officer.

Community Service Orders

Instead of imposing a sentence of imprisonment, a court may make a community service order directing the offender to perform community service work for a specified number of hours in a placement area.

The placement area should be a public institution and be within the proximity of the offender's residential place.

The client's services are supervised by an officer from the public institution who then reports the offender's progress to correctional officers. Other offenders' sentencing options include curfew, Electronic Monitoring, Restitution, Bail Supervision Programmes etc.

When the King renamed the then Swaziland Prisons Service to His Majesty's Correctional Services in 1995, he had good intentions for doing so than mere change in name. Ideally the change sought to introduce the Service to a new culture of correctional business, replacing the punitive practices of the prison regime which viewed inmates as sub-humans by investing very little efforts towards the promotion of inherent human rights and fundamental freedoms in places of detention.

The change in name marked a paradigm shift incorrectional principles and practices to embody a concept placing great emphasis in the observation of offenders' constitutional rights and human dignity. However, this was not to be achieved without shedding more efforts in influencing the whole correctional machinery including society to understand and adopt the principles as the new order of conducting correctional business in the twenty first century. Having been in this new experience for almost two decades now has exposed the Service and its personnel to more ground breaking developments which have helped a great deal in marketing the image of the department in the country and the SADC region. However, there is still lot of work to be done to elevate the status of the department to match with corrections standard in the world as envisaged by the King.

One area of concern is the reviewing of legal instruments without which the Service cannot implement some of the key programmes required in a fullyfledged correctional Service. Notwithstanding this the commissioner general applauds government's efforts in assisting the Service achieve significant progress in this regard. Government, through the Minister of Justice and Constitutional Affairs Senator Edgar Hillary together with Ntshangase and officials from relevant ministries, successfully presented the Correctional Services Bill, 2016 to Cabinet in the past year. Both pieces of legislations, the Correctional Services Bill, 2016 and the Criminal Procedure and (Amendment) Bill, 2016 are now waiting to be debated by Parliament.

The latter seeks to give a time frame to previous conviction records of ex-offenders. It is hoped the success of all these efforts will be one of the pillars to usher the country to the first world status by 2022.

Authority

Dealing with Diabetes

oday we are looking at how diabetes and cancer are related. People usually say that when a person is diabetic, cancer is likely to affect this person.

I'm not saying it is true but let's learn more about this. Diabetes and cancer are known as non-communicable diseases (NCD), that's where they are firstly connected. This means they are non-infectious and non-transmissible among people. Now let us continue with this discussion by including important tips on how people can manage to live with diabetes and

Diabetes is a condition in which the body does not make or properly use a pancreatic hormone called insulin. Insulin helps the body use glucose (sugar) efficiently. Normally, insulin allows glucose to enter cells and be used for energy. According to the Pancreatic Cancer Network, in the case of diabetes, either the body does not produce enough insulin or the amount that is produced is not fully effective. Research studies suggest that new-onset diabetes in people over the age of 50 may be an early symptom of pancreatic cancer. A sudden change in blood sugar levels in diabetics who previously had well-controlled diabetes may also be a sign of pancreatic cancer.

HOW DOES DIABETES RELATE TO PANCREATIC CANCER?

Diabetes may be either a risk factor or a symptom of pancreatic cancer. Pancreatic cancer is two times more likely to occur in people who have diabetes than in people who do not have diabetes. In pancreatic cancer patients who have had diabetes for less than five years, it is unclear if the diabetes contributed to the cancer or if the precancerous cells caused the diabetes

WHAT FOODS MAY HELP **CONTROL DIABETES?**


People with diabetes and cancer have special nutritional needs. An individual can have a positive influence on his/her blood glucose and overall health by choosing foods wisely. By eating well-balanced meals in the correct amounts, individuals can keep their blood glucose level as close to normal (non-diabetes) level) as possible. The proper balance of nutrients from food, medication, physical activity and nutritional supplements are needed to improve blood glucose control, physical healing, weight maintenance and quality of life. No single food will supply all the nutrients a body needs, so good nutrition means eating a variety of foods.

It is important to eat foods from each group at each meal every day. Foods are divided into five main groups:

- Fruits and vegetables (oranges, apples, bananas, carrots, and spinach)
- . Whole grains, cereals, and bread (wheat,
- rice, oats, bran and barley) · Dairy products (milk, cheese, and yoghurt)
- . Meats and meat substitutes (fish, poultry, eggs, dried beans and nuts)
- Fats and oils (oil, butter, and margarine)

By eating foods from each food group at every meal, an individual is likely to consume a proper balance of all the nutrients (carbohydrates, proteins, fats, vitamins and minerals) that the body needs to function. Eating meals and snacks at regular times is also necessary for controlling blood sugar levels. The body uses calories from carbohydrates for energy and uses protein to build lean body mass.

DIABETES AND CANCER



Choosing foods with complex carbohydrates, such as starch and fiber, may help in the control of blood glucose levels. Fiber present in plant-based foods can help lower blood glucose and cholesterol levels. Foods high in fiber include: bran cereals, cooked beans and peas, whole-grain bread, fruits and vegetables. Eating high-protein foods at each meal and snack also may help in the control of blood sugar. Healthy choices are dried beans, peas, lentils, lean meats and low-fat dairy products. Including small amounts of healthy fat may also help control blood sugar levels. Foods high in healthy fats include: olive, canola and peanut oils, olives, avocados, nuts and seeds and fatty fish such as mackerel, lake trout, herring, sardines, albacore tuna and salmon.

SHOULD DIABETICS WITH PANCREATIC CANCER AVOID EATING ALL SUGAR

No, unless this is the advice of a physician or dietitian. Cutting all forms of sugar out of the diet will not result in the death of cancer cells because cancer cells cannot be starved. Glucose is the basic food source for all cells, including cancer cells and is provided by eating foods containing carbohydrates. It may be necessary to avoid foods high in simple sugars if the individual experiences problems with watery diarrhea after eating such foods. Foods high in simple sugars include rich desserts, ice cream, candy, sweetened drinks and fruits packed in syrup. If the patient is experiencing weight loss unrelated to blood sugar control, it may be caused by cancer induced weight loss, called cancer cachexia. In this situation, chemical changes in the body cause the breakdown of body fat and lean body mass to make energy for cancer and healthy cells. It may be necessary to introduce another supplement into the diet. Consult your doctor or dietitian to find out which supplement is right for you.

There are ways you can lower your risk for type 2 diabetes and certain types of cancers:

- Liver
- Pancreas
- Colon
- Breast
- Bladder

Type 2 diabetes and certain cancers share some risk factors:

Age - As you get older, your risk for both type 2 diabetes and cancer goes up.

Gender - Overall, cancer occurs more often in men. Men also have a slightly higher risk of diabetes than women.

Race/ethnicity - African Americans and

non-Hispanic whites are more likely to develop cancer. African Americans, Native Americans, Hispanics/Latinos, and Asian Americans/Pacific Islanders are at higher risk for developing type 2 diabetes.

Overweight - Being overweight can increase your risk of type 2 diabetes and certain types of cancer.

Inactivity - Higher physical activity levels lower the risk of type 2 diabetes and certain types of cancer.

Smoking - Smoking is linked to several types of cancer. Studies suggest that smoking is a risk factor for the development of type 2 diabetes.

Alcohol - Drinking more than one drink a day for women or two drinks a day for men raises the risk for both diabetes and cancer.

Treating diabetes in a person with active cancer is often complicated by the cancer, cancer therapies, and the adverse effects of treatment (such as anorexia, nausea, weight loss). Acute diabetes complications and the urgency of treating severe hyperglycemia may delay cancer treatment. Hyperglycemia (high blood glucose) first recognized during cancer therapy should not be neglected, and the patient and the family should be taught to monitor blood glucose concentrations. Hyperglycemia can and possibly will occur again during subsequent treatment cycles. If hyperglycemia is recognized and appropriately treated, severe acute hyperglycemic complications can be prevented. According to American Diabetes Association, although cancer treatments don't cause diabetes, high blood sugar must be aggressively managed during treatment. Radiation therapy, steroids and certain chemotherapy drugs can cause blood sugar levels to rise. For cancer patients with preexisting diabetes, their doctor may have to supplement their regular insulin with fast-acting insulin to bring levels back to normal. For battents who don't have pre-existing diabetes, high blood sugar levels are managed with a "sliding" insulin regimen, starting out with larger doses and then tapering off as sugar levels normalize.

LOWER YOUR RISKS

Lose weight - If you are overweight, even losing 7% of your weight (15 pounds if you weigh 200 pounds) can make a big difference. Use the Body Mass Index (BMI) Calculator to find out how much weight you need to lose.

Eat healthy - Choose a diet with plenty of:

Fresh vegetables - The best choices are fresh, frozen, and canned vegetables and vegetable juices without added sodium, fat, or sugar. For good health, try to eat at least 3-5 daily servings of vegetables, including asparagus, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, eggplant, greens, peppers, snap peas and tomatoes. A serving of vegetables is ½ cup of cooked vegetables or vegetable juice; or 1 cup of raw vegetables.

Whole grains - A whole grain is the entire grain, which includes the bran, germ and endosperm (starchy part). Shop for cereals and grains that have the first ingredient with a whole grain such as bulgur (cracked wheat), whole wheat flour, whole oats/oatmeal, whole grain com/corn meal, brown rice or whole rye. Try to include dried beans, legumes, peas and lentils into several meals per week. They are a great source of protein and are loaded with fiber, vitamins and minerals.

Fruits - Eat fruits that are fresh, frozen or canned without added sugars. Common fruits include apples, blackberries, blueberries, cantaloupe, dates, figs, grapes, oranges, pears and strawberries.

CHOOSE HEALTHIER OPTIONS:

Low-fat or non-fat dairy products -

Choose fat-free or low-fat (1%) milk, non-fat yoghurt (without added sugar), and unflavored soy milk.

Lean meats - The best choices are cuts of meats and meat alternatives that are lower in saturated fat and calories. Include fish and seafood, poultry without the skin, eggs and choice grades of meats trimmed of fat. Also, select dried beans, legumes, peas, and lentils.

MOST IMPORTANTLY, BECAUSE TO **WATCH PORTION SIZES**

Stay active - Set a goal to exercise five days a week. Thirty minutes of brisk walking or a similar activity will work. You can even break it up into 3 10-minute blocks if it is easier to fit in your day.

Quit smoking - If you smoke, learn how you can quit. Prepare to quit by setting a date to quit, throwing away your cigarettes or asking others for help. Then choose a quitting strategy, such as going cold turkey, tapering off or working with your health care professional. If you don't smoke, never start.

GET RECOMMENDED CANCER SCREENINGS

Work with your health care provider to see what types of cancer screenings you should have. Your age and gender will help determine what screenings are recommended.

Some cancers (such as pancreatic cancer) are associated with newly diagnosed diabetes.

Cancer-related decreased physical activity can reduce insulin sensitivity. A common thread for many of these risk factors is hyperinsulinemia (excess levels of insulin circulating in the blood than expected relative to the level of glucose). Insulin induces cell proliferation. Hyperinsulinemia, insulin resistance, and obesity are associated with increased estrogens, endometrial hyperplasia (womb) and breast and endometrial cancers.

Grateful



The latest praise and worship album is in fact a testimony and a peek into Makhabane's 2014 experience where he almost joined the Creator in that freak accident. The album My Journey was released a fortnight ago and is presently enjoying incessant airplay at both VOC and SBIS (Christian and national radio stations, respectively in Swaziland) whilst beyond the country's borders it has been making waves at the popular Ukhozi FM amongst other top radio stations in the Republic.

But for now, Makhabane said, the radio stations were flashing singles as the full album is yet to be made available.

"In fact it would be released on full scale effectively from March 1," he said.

He says; "When some turned to social media to pass R.I.P. messages after the December 2014 accident, God, interpreted this as "Return If Possible" and I am back on my feet having gained renewed strength and vigour to press on with life," the 'Big Fish' says.

Also providing essential back-up in the upcoming album is Makhabane's long time acquaintance Nhlambeni MP Frans

Dlamini. The latter composed Track 13 Seyingcosana.

At least eight of the songs were written or composed by Makhabane.

Tracks in the album are; Sinomhlobo, Sohlabelela, Sikwenza Mkhulu, Ayibalwa Iminyaka, Morena Jesu, Moya Oyingcwele, Praying for you (composed by Shadrack Ndlovu) and Siyabonga Baba amongst others.

It wouldn't have been a complete album without an instrumental piece, something that is now a trademark of the 'Big Fish' after all.

Denzel Erasmus provides saxophone whilst providing the programming was done by Shadrack Ndlovu and Ntobeko Maco.

One of Makhabane's long-time friend and backup artist Buhle Hlangulela re-arranged the track *Moya Oyingcwele*, providing much needed fluidity and flair to the works.

Already messages which Makhabane shared with this newspaper reflect that a section of his fans are eagerly awaiting the album and would pay anything to get hold of it.

"Please *Bhuti* even if it would cost me E200 or E300 I'm willing to part with the cash; where can I get it?" one supporter posted on Makhabane's WhatsApp messenger application. Another wanted to know whether it was now available locally and at which music stores.

Having debuted with 'Thum'Umlilo' in 1993, Makhabane went on to become a household name in traditional gospel music resulting in his tracks adopted as national anthems of some churches or denominations. He has collaborated with a number of renowned artists such as Jabu Hlongwane, the late Vuyo Mokoena, Rebecca Malope,

L&E: What sports do you play? Lindokuhle: I love netball and have been playing it since high school, I also have a thing for basketball and volleyball.


L&E: People have the perception that if you are tall, you have to be a model, what is your take?




L&E: So have you ever modeled before? Lindokuhle: Unfortunately no, not yet but








have preached that a low-fat diet is the key to losing weight, managing cholesterol, and preventing health problems.

But more than just the amount of fat, it's the types of fat you eat that really matter. Bad fats increase cholesterol and your risk of certain diseases, while good fats protect your heart and support overall health. In fact, good fats such as omega-3 fats are essential to physical and emotional health.

MAKING SENSE OF DIETARY FAT

Dietary fats are found in food from plants and animals. The four major types are:

- Monounsaturated fats
- Polyunsaturated fats (including omega-3s)
- Trans fats
- Saturated fats

Despite what you may have been told, not all fats are bad guys in the waistline wars. While dietary fats all contain nine calories per gram, they can have very different effects on your health as well as your weight. "Bad" fats, such as trans fats, are guilty of the unhealthy things all fats have been blamed for weight gain, clogged arteries, and so forth. But good fats such as omega-3s have the opposite effect. In fact, healthy fats play a huge role in helping you manage your moods, stay on top of your mental game, fight fatigue and even control your weight.

UNSATURATED FATS AND OILS

Unsaturated fats are considered "good" fats and are encouraged as part of a healthy diet. Eating foods rich in monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fat can improve blood cholesterol levels and lower your risk of heart disease. These fats may also benefit insulin levels and controlling blood sugar, which can be especially helpful if you have type 2 diabetes. These good fats include:

MONOUNSATURATED FATS

- Avocados
- Olives
- Nuts (almonds, peanuts, macadamia nuts, hazelnuts, pecans, cashews)
- Natural peanut butter (containing just peanuts and salt)


POLYUNSATURATED FATS

- Walnuts
- Sunflower, sesame, and pumpkin seeds
- Flaxseed
- Fatty fish (salmon, tuna, mackerel, herring, trout, sardines)

DAMAGED FATS: WHEN GOOD FATS GO BAD

A good fat can become bad if heat. Light or oxygen damages it. Oils that are high in polyunsaturated fats (such as flaxseed oil) must be refrigerated and kept in an opaque container. Never use oils, seeds, or nuts after they begin to smell or taste rank or bitter. Cooking at high heat with some monounsaturated or polyunsaturated oils can also damage the fat.

CHOOSING HEALTHY FATS



GETTING MORE GOOD FATS IN YOUR DIETS

The best sources of healthy monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fats are fish, nuts, seeds, and cold-pressed vegetable oils.

Make friends with olive oil: Use coldpressed extra-virgin olive oil to dress salads, cooked vegetables, or pasta dishes. Also use olive oil for stovetop cooking, rather than stick margarine or canola oil. For baking, most chefs prefer butter or ghee (clarified butter).

Dress your own salad: Commercial salad dressings are often high in calories, saturated fat, or made with damaged trans fat oils. Create your own healthy dressings with extra virgin olive oil, flaxseed oil, or sesame oil.

Eat more avocados: Try them in sandwiches or salads or make guacamole. Along with being loaded with heart and brainhealthy fats, they make for a filling and satisfying meal.

Reach for the nuts: You can also add nuts to vegetable dishes or use them instead of breadcrumbs on chicken or fish.

Snack on olives: Olives are high in healthy monounsaturated fats. But unlike most other high-fat foods, they make for a low-calorie snack when eaten on their own. Try them plain or make a tapenade for dipping.

TRANSFAT: ELIMINATE THIS BAD FAT FROM YOUR DIET

Small amounts of naturally occurring trans fats can be found in meat and dairy products but it's the artificial trans fats that are considered dangerous. These are normal fat molecules that have been twisted and deformed during a process called hydrogenation. During this process, liquid vegetable oil is heated and combined with hydrogen gas. Partially hydrogenating vegetable oils makes them more stable and less likely to spoil, which is very good for food manufacturers and very bad for you.

Trans fats raise your LDL ("bad") cholesterol and lower your HDL ("good") cholesterol and increases your risk of heart disease, stroke, and diabetes. No amount of trans fats is healthy.

- Commercially-baked goods (cookies, crackers, cakes, muffins, pie crusts, pizza dough, breads like hamburger buns)
- Packaged snack foods (crackers,
- microwave popcorn, chips, candy)
 Solid fats (stick margarine, vegetable shortening)
- Fried foods (French fries, fried chicken, chicken nuggets, breaded fish)
- Per-mixed products (cake mix, pancake, and chocolate milk)
- Anything with "partially hydrogenated" oil listed in the ingredients.

SATURATED FAT: GOOD OR BAD?

Saturated fats are mainly found in tropical oils, dairy and animal products such as red meat, while poultry and fish also contain some saturated fat. Eating saturated fats won't lower your risk of heart disease like monounsaturated or polyunsaturated fats, but the latest studies suggest that not all saturated fat is a dietary demon, either. People who eat lots of saturated fat do not experience more cardiovascular disease than those who eat less. In fact, recent evidence suggests that consuming whole-fat dairy may even have beneficial effects for some people, including helping to control weight.

Of course, not all saturated fat is the same. The saturated fat in whole milk, coconut oil, or salmon is different to the saturated fat found in pizza, French fries, and processed meat products (such as ham, sausage, hot dogs, salami, and other cold cuts) which have been linked to coronary disease and cancer. And just as saturated fat varies according to its source, the effect of saturated fats on blood cholesterol varies from person to person, depending on genetics and other health factors.

MAKING SMART CHOICES ABOUT SATURATED FAT

- Avoid saturated fat from processed meats, packaged meals and takeout food.
- Don't replace healthy sources of saturated fat with refined carbohydrates or sugary snacks.

 Don't eat just red meat (beef, pork, or lamb) but vary your diet with free range chicken, eggs, fish, and vegetarian sources of protein

- When you choose to eat red meat, look for "organic" and "grass-fed".
- Roast, grill, or slow cook meat and poultry instead of frying.
- Enjoy full-fat dairy and choose organic or raw milk, cheese, butter, and yoghurt when possible.
- Avoid breaded meats and vegetables and deep-fried foods.
- Avoid snack foods such as corn or potato chips.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR CHOOSING HEALTHY FATS

- If you are concerned about your weight or overall health, rather than avoiding fat in your diet, try replacing trans fats and saturated fats from fried or processed foods with good fats, such as fish, olive oil, nuts, avocados, and high-quality dairy.
- Try to eliminate trans fats from your diet. Check food labels for trans fats or any kind of "partially hydrogenated" oil. Avoiding commercially-baked goods, margarines, and limiting fast food goes a long way to cutting out this dangerous fat from your diet.
- Reduce or eliminate fried food. While there's a movement to ban trans fat in the U.S., that won't necessary make your French fries any healthier, especially if the food industry decides to cook them in vegetable oils that oxidise when heated. The safer option is to cut down on fried foods altogether.
- Eat omega-3 fats every day. Good sources include fish and fish oil, walnuts, flax seeds, and flaxseed oil. Try adding ground flaxseed meal to your breakfast cereal or instigating a "fish Friday."
- Choose your oils carefully. Coldpressed, organic oils retain all the nutrients that are burned away in industrially manufactured oils, many of which can become toxic when heated.

FOCUS ON FAT FROM REAL FOOD, NOT PROCESSED FOOD

There are many opinions and few absolutes in the nutrition world. For most of us, it is our overall dietary pattern that is more important than specific foods. What we do know for sure is that the typical western diet filled with fried, processed foods, packaged meals and sugary snacks is leading to higher rates of obesity and illness. Eating less manufactured and industrially processed food and more "real", natural food fresh from the ground, the ocean, or small, local farms is a sound place to start for all your food choices, including dietary fats.

The answer for a healthy diet isn't to cut out the fat it's to replace bad fats with the good ones that promote health and well-being.



The cat should see a vet quickly. Fear and anxiety caused by stress are the main problems behind peeing indoors. Stress-related behaviours include urine marking or spraying, biting or scratching, loss of appetite, hiding or a reduced desire to play and interact. Cats often experience stress, perhaps because of their small size and vulnerability.

Cats like consistency. Many cats stress with a small disruption in their routine such as moving furniture around. Going to the vet is stressful for most cats. Cats stress if the inner security of their home is threatened by newcomers such as visitors or workmen or visiting strange cats or dogs, or when a new member joins the household a baby or new dog or cat.

All cats, male or female, entire or neutered, can spray but territorial marking is usually restricted to entire males. When neutered males or females spray it is usually from stress - alerting other cats of their

COPING WITH CAT STRESS

This is a critical time in their emotional development when stimulating but happy experienceswill help them develop coping mechanisms for later life. Kittens should be played with and handled by different people but always without fear or anxiety.

If possible identify the cause of the stress and remove it.

Stick to a strict feeding routine and place the food where the cat can eat undisturbed.

Give your cat lots of affection and play with him. You can buy or easily make a simple cat toy with a tuft of feathers tied on a length of string to a stick or a small soft ball (some cats play great games of fetch) or other soft toy made from scraps of material or old socks tied with string and decorated with bits of wool or other fabric.

Make sure the cat has an easy route in and out of the house and a safe quiet place to

To introduce a new cat, put the new cat in a closed room with a litterbox, water and food and let the current cat have free range so that the cats can smell each other under the door. Next day, close up the house and swap them round so that the new cat leaves its scent around the house (but is not able to escape).

After 3-5 days, close up the house and let them have free range indoors together. Allow the new cat access to outdoors only when it has relaxed, otherwise it will probably run away. Take it slow. Never push cats together; they need their own space.

A timid cat can be desensitised to a busy household by exposing it in such a way that it feels safe. Put it in a cat carrier, partly covered by a blanket so the cat can see but has a safe-feeling retreat. Leave it in the middle of the household activity for 1-2 hours a day until it relaxes.

t is one of life's greatest pleasures and vital for the survival of the human race. There are obvious reasons why having sex is good for you - love, baby making and pleasure, to start with.

But, the benefits go much further. Experts agree, getting frisky between the sheets can actually be good for a person's

health - in more than one way.

From warding off a cold, to helping prevent a heart attack, we reveal five ways, making love is one of the few pleasures in life that is genuinely good for you.

So if you really need an excuse to heat things up in the bedroom, read on...

IT REALLY DOES IMPROVE YOUR MOOD

The evidence suggests that the 'feelgood' effect of making love could be more about chemicals than sexual ability.

During lovemaking and orgasm, a cocktail of endorphins - the body's natural moodlifting opiates - neurotransmitters and hormones are released.

Oxytocin, in particular, is a hormone released during and after sex that has been shown to make people more generous towards their partners and can also help induce calm and sleep.

Oxytocin is called the 'cuddling' hormone because it's released after just 20 minutes of hugging. Women produce four times as much as men, for whom production is inhibited by the prevalence of the hormone testosterone, which drives libido.

In fact, the Top Sante research found our favourite simple pleasure was a hug - that's oxytocin at work. Another key neurotransmitter is serotonin, the body's key antidepressant chemical and one of the major reasons people smile and feel happy and relaxed after sex. Sexually active women in longterm relationships were less likely to be depressed than women who went without sex, according to a study of nearly 300 women by American psychologist Gordon Gallup and published in the Archives Of Sexual Behaviour. Gallup speculated that semen contains several hormones which may have a mood-boosting effect when they are absorbed through the vaginal wall into the bloodstream.

IT'S GOOD FOR YOUR HEART

A study at Queens University in Belfast found that having sex three times a week could actually halve the risk of heart attack or stroke.

Indeed, the idea that men are more at risk of a heart attack during love-making is mostly misconception, say experts.

Professor Peter Weisberg, medical director of the British Heart Foundation, says there is no evidence that men who have sex regularly in their 40s, 50s and beyond are at an increased risk of heart attack.


"As far as the heart is concerned, sex is just another form of exercise," says Dr Graham Jackson, consultant cardiologist at Guy's & St Thomas' Hospital and president of the Sexual Dysfunction Association.

"In fitness terms, it's equivalent is going for a mile-long walk or climbing up and down two flights of stairs.

"If you're physically fit enough for that,

there should be no increased risk during sex."

AND IT CAN WARD OFF A COLD

Having more sex might increase immunity from colds and flu.

Getting down to it once or twice a week has been linked with higher levels of immunoglobulin A, or IgA, a substance found in saliva and the nasal lining thought to help our immune systems fight colds and flu. In one study, scientists asked 11 volunteers how often they had had sex over the previous month, then measured levels of IgA in their saliva.

Those who had sex once a week or less had a slight increase, compared with those who abstained; but those who made love more often had 30 percent higher levels.

Getting down to it once or twice a week has been linked with higher levels of immunoglobulin A, a substance found in saliva that is thought to help our immune systems fight off colds and flu

YOU'LL LIVE LONGER

One of the largest studies on longevity and sex – conducted on Welsh men – found that those who had sex less than once a month had double the risk of dying prematurely than those who had sex twice a week.

"Sexual activity seems to have a protective effect on men's health," says Dr Brewer.

"This may be linked with the effects of the master sex hormone, DHEA or dehydroepiandroterone, which is made in the adrenal glands and functions as a building block of other hormones such as oestrogen, testosterone and progesterone.

"DHEA levels rise just before orgasm and ejaculation to three times higher than normal, and some claim this is how regular sex can prolong your life."

IT CAN BOOST FERTILITY

For people trying to conceive, one of the

biggest myths associated with fertility is that refraining from ejaculation boosts sperm motility - that's the rate at which

etrate an egg for fertilisation, says gynaecologist Dr Gillian Lockwood, medical director of Midlands Fertility Services.

"When sperm is hanging around in the epididymis, the long coiled tube in the back of the testes where sperm is stored, it dies off rapidly," she says.

"Unless a man has a low sperm count, the more often he has sex, then the better the quality of his sperm," she says.

Preliminary results of a small study by Australian researchers found that in men whose sperm showed significant DNA damage, daily ejaculation reduced this damage by 12 percent.

"When it comes to sex for fertility, having sex little and often – at least every other night – is far better than lots of it on infrequent occasions," says Dr Lockwood.

HIV TRAFFIC LIGHTS....

Everyone who has been on the road is familiar with traffic lights, the colors and what they stand for. Whenever you drive inside town the most important thing to look out for are the traffic lights because any failure to do so gets you into the danger of being involved in an accident.

Then there are sexual practices that are a yellow traffic light, which means as much as they pose minimal danger from the look of things, they still are to a certain extent posing a risk to HIV infection hence one has to thread carefully even with that amount of protection.

The best option and safest as far as HIV infection is concerned is the green light, which says you are safe and protected, all indications favor you. These are actually sexual practices that guarantees safety from HIV infection which includes abstinence, correct consistent condom use with one partner whose HIV negative status you know, amongst others. The message is for everyone to make an effort to ride with the green traffic light when it comes to HIV matters.

Business expansion is what every small business owner dreams of doing one day. However, the strategies that are employed in the running of the business demonstrate the direction of our businesses. We can then safely state that it is not about expansion, but rather strategic expansion.

BECOME A LEADER IN THE INDUSTRY

Another point to consider is the need to become the leader in the industry. Though it is not easy to penetrate the market barriers, small businesses must act like big businesses that often make their name by leading an industry. They make moves when other businesses sit by the wayside.

GOING GLOBAL

Expanded markets entice many business people into going global. William Edwards of All Business explains that going global can reduce a company's reliance on local and national markets. UP campus can't open without an agreement - EFF

RETORIA - The Economic Freedom Fighters Student Command at the University of Pretoria says classes at the institution cannot resume without an agreement being reached with management.

"Campus can't open when there is no agreement," said chairperson, Kabelo Mahlobogwane.

He said they had a meeting with the vice chancellor, Professor Cheryl de la Rey, but they could not reach an agreement.

Mahlobogwane said the university had still not accepted their memorandum

and they want to discuss that first before returning to class.

"We don't want to go back to Tukkies, we want to go back to the University of Pretoria. It must be transformed first. We will wait for the university to give us a date on when we are going to start engaging on the memorandum," he

Peaceful engagements

Mahlobogwane said they would afford the university an opportunity to engage with them yesterday and meet with students on Monday to get a mandate on the way forward.

"It is clear that we will not go back to an un-transformed institution," he

De la Rey said the institution would resume activities on Monday. She said extra security would be brought in and they would also be working with the South African Police Service to restore order.

> She said they would adopt a

zero tolerance to violence

and crime when the institution opened its doors next week.

"Given what happened, we have taken additional security measures and we have taken time to work with the South African Police Service and we are saying enough is enough.

"We commit to peaceful engagements but we cannot have disruptions to the academic programme. We cannot have intimidations; we cannot have threats levelled to students, staff and anyone else who want to be part of this," she said.

Zero tolerance for troublemakers Students at the university have been protesting over its language policy. At least 27 people were arrested last Friday for public violence and they appeared in court on Monday.

Charges against three of them were dropped, leaving only 24 students to stand trial. Their case was postponed to April 7.

The university has been closed due to the ongoing student protests and violence.

De la Rey said she had been meeting with different structures at the institution to find an amicable solution to issues raised and to ensure that the academic programme could return to normal

But she vowed to that the institution would use its authority to deal with troublemakers.

King Dalindyebo back in prison after hospital stay

OHANNESBURG -Abathembu King Buyelekhaya Dalindyebo has been discharged from a private hospital, the Department of Correctional Services said yesterday.

This was Dalindyebo's second hospital visit since he began his 12-year prison sentence at the East London Maximum Correctional Centre.

The department of correctional services confirmed that the King had been transferred back to jail.

"He went back to prison yesterday," spokesperson Manelisi Wolela said yesterday.

Earlier this year Dalindyebo was transferred to St Dominics hospital, about six kilometres from the prison, when he fell ill due to a hunger strike he had embarked on.

He was admitted on January 8 and discharged on January 15. Two days after his discharge, he

was readmitted to a private hospital when he relapsed and fainted in front of prison wardens. He had spent a total of 48 days in hospital since his imprisonment.

At the time of his second admission to hospital, family spokesperson Mthunzi Ngonyama told News24 that Dalindyebo could not eat prison food as he was on a special diet for his stomach ulcers.

Dalindyebo handed himself over at the Mthatha Correctional Centre on December 30 last year after unsuccessfully trying several legal avenues to avoid serving his 12-year jail sentence

He was then transferred to the East London Maximum Correctional Centre, the following day

In 2009, he was sentenced to 15 years in prison for culpable homicide, assault with intent to do grievous bodily harm, arson, and kidnapping. News24

De la Rey **Enough is enough**

RETORIA - The University of Pretoria will adopt a zero tolerance to violence and crime when the institution opens its doors next week, its vice chancellor, Professor Cheryl de la Rey, said.

"Given what happened, we have taken additional security measures and we have taken time to work with the South African Police Service and we are saying enough is enough," she

"We commit to peaceful engagements but we cannot have disruptions to the academic programme. We cannot have intimidations, we cannot have threats levelled to students, staff and anyone else who want to be part

Students at the university have been protesting over its language policy. At least 27 people were arrested last Friday for public violence and they appeared in court on Monday.

Charges against three of them were dropped, leaving only 24 students to stand trial. Their case was postponed to April 7. The university has been closed due to the ongoing student protests and violence

De la Rey said she had been meeting with different structures at the institution to find an amicable solution to issues raised and to ensure that the academic programme could return to normal. But she vowed that the institution would use its authority to deal with troublemakers.

"We will employ an approach of zero tolerance. That means we will use all our internal procedures as relevant. If an act is a crime, we are going to treat it as a crime. We have internal process for transgressions of our code of conduct but if something is a crime, it must be dealt with as a crime," she said.

Gordhan threatened to quit as SARS wars escalate

APE TOWN - Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan threatened to resign ahead of his crucial budget address over an alleged clash with SARS commissioner Tom Moyane and ultimately a "proxy war" with President Jacob Zuma, reports said yesterday.

His threat reportedly emerged after the Hawks sent Gordhan a letter, questioning him over his role in the alleged rogue unit at SARS during his tenure as commissioner from 1999 to 2009, according to reports in Business Day and the Mail & Guardian (M&G) yesterday. "At the heart of the battle is the recapturing of SARS from perceived Zuma allies," the M&G said. "A source with close access to Gordhan said the letter from the Hawks arrived late last week. He said it contained 'nonsense questions' and seemed calculated to destabilise the finance minister as he prepared his budget speech," it said. "He also claimed that the Hawks were being abused to fight the proxy war with Gordhan." The battle started well before Gordhan was reappointed as Finance minister, with Moyane using the contentious rogue report to oust senior SARS officials who were

close to Gordhan. A new inner circle close to Moyane has now been formed in an alleged bid to protect Zuma and his allies. "Gordhan was (first) targeted after a leaked copy of a KPMG document reportedly recommended that he be questioned about the unit," Business Day said. "It's allegations that have no foundation," Gordhan told press after he was reappointed in December. "They are based on a leaked document that even I haven't seen." "Where is this mysterious report? KPMG has a cheek to say he [Gordhan] doesn't know anything but he should know. I thought forensic people are supposed to come up with facts. What does that say about the reputation of KPMG?" Gordhan asked at the time. "According to one account from an alliance leader who is close to the president, Zuma instructed Hawks boss Berning Ntlemeza to inform Gordhan that he was being investigated the day after his appointment (as

December)," the M&G reported. News24

North West University exco targets 'outside interests' in protest probe

APE TOWN - The "role played by non-students and outside interests" seem to be of most concern to North-West University's (NWU) executive committee (EXCO).

The exco said in a statement that it "intends to obtain full information regarding the sequence of events that gave rise to the eventual sad and disturbing state of affairs which occurred at the Mafikeng Campus".

Aside from the external influences "in the instigation of the violence and vandalism", it will seek answers on

"the role of campus security, and the steps taken by campus management, in general, to monitor and manage the situation".

The campus is expected to be closed for at least a month as management called a halt to operations and advised students "to leave the campus immediately for their own safety" after buildings were gutted this week.

"Recent developments have put considerable strain on the institutional management as well as the respective campus managements of the NWU," the exco's statement read.

"Exco wishes to express its continued support to all spheres of management at the NWU. Exco has full confidence in the ability of management, under the leadership of the vice-chancellor, Professor Dan Kgwadi, to effectively and wisely deal with the situation."

Kgwadi's name was mentioned by the Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) - who have been widely blamed for the protests that turned violent - in its statement earlier this week.

Peacekeeper kills own commander

BAMAKO - A soldier in the Chadian contingent of the UN's peacekeeping force in northern Mali killed his own commander and an army doctor on Thursday following weeks of tensions over living conditions, UN sources told AFP.

The soldier had started an "insurrection" against the contingent's top brass the previous evening before shooting the two men dead, said a source within the UN force, known by the acronym MINUSMA. AFP

ABUJA - At least 26 Boko Haram Islamic insurgents were killed on Thursday after they attacked a camp for displaced people in north-eastern Nigeria.

The attack in Dikwa town in Bornu State also claimed the lives of a soldier and a member of a local vigilante group, the Nigerian military said in a statement. "The troops recovered 26 bodies of the Boko Haram terrorists, while others escaped with gunshot wounds," the statement said. Four residents of the camp, three soldiers and numerous insurgents were injured, many of them critically. dpa

HARARE – Lions are avoiding homesteads fitted with flashing LED

lights in the Hwange district, a conservation group reported this week. The "predator deterring" lights were fitted to 15 homes in the Matetsi Environmental



Conservation Area at the end of 2015 as part of a project aimed at trying to cut down on conflict between humans and lions in the area, the ALERT group said in an update.

ISIS chief captured in w Libya

TRIPOLI - A local chief of ISIS and two aides have been captured in a city near Libya's capital, according to the Tripolibased government which is not internationally recognised. The Tripoli interior ministry's special forces unit, on its Facebook page, said the ISIS "emir" for Sabratha, Mohamed Saad al-Tajuri, also known as Abu Sleiman, was seized in the city, 70km west of the capital. The campaign, in solidarity with author Ahmed Naji, launched on Thursday a series of video messages from intellectuals in support of creative freedom. In the first video, well-known Egyptian scriptwriter Medhat El Adl said the sentence against novelist Ahmed Naji came as an "extreme shock" to writers and artists. and expressed concern for the future of art in Egypt. EU mission calls on Uganda to release detailed election results

AMPALA - A
European Union mission
urged Uganda on
Thursday to release detailed
results from last week's presidential election, which extended
President Yoweri Museveni's 30year rule but which the opposition has called fraudulent.

Uganda's Electoral Commission declared Museveni, 71 and in power since 1986, the winner of the February 18 vote with about 60 percent of the vote. The EU's Election Observation Mission statement was released soon after an aide to Kizza Besigye, the main challenger, said Besigye had been arrested for the sixth time in about a week.

Besigye, who challenged Museveni in three previous elections, was also blocked from leaving his house on Wednesday, when local elections were held across Uganda.

Human rights groups say they have been blocked from meeting with him.

The EU mission "encourages the Electoral Commission to publish without delay the detailed results from each polling station" so that voters and the candidates can "comprehensively evaluate the election results," it said in a statement.


"The electoral process is completed only when all candidates have rightfully exercised the relevant legal avenues without fear, intimidation or other undue restrictions," Eduard Kukan, the chief observer, said in a statement.

Candidates have 10 days after a winner is declared to contest an election's outcome. A spokeswoman for Besigye said his party has yet to decide whether it will formally dispute the results, but

said Besigye's detentions are creating an obstacle to its activities.

"The arrest of our candidate ... has eaten some of the time we have to lodge a petition," said Ingrid Turinawe. A second party official said that police had arrested 21 party officials since Tuesday in various of the country. Police prevented Besigye from travelling to vote in local council elections because they suspected he wanted to "link up with his supporters to engage in illegal protests", police spokesman Patrick Onyango said.

UBA - South Sudan's warring sides have "no option" but to respect a peace deal, UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon said Thursday as he visited the war-scorched nation.

Ban said the enduring
"nightmare" in the world's
youngest country included
"killings, rapes, children
forced to become soldiers,"
and "over two million people
forced to flee their homes."

"The government of South Sudan must step up...(to) its responsibility and protect its population," he said after talks with President Salva Kiir and his estranged former deputy Riek Machar, whose dispute triggered civil war in December 2013.

"South Sudan now has a peace agreement signed last August... (not) respecting the terms of the peace agreement

Mugabe Donates 300 Cattle to African Union

ARARE - No longer able to feed itself and with three million of its citizens facing hunger after a severe drought, Zimbabwe earlier this month appealed for \$1.6bln from donors to help avert starvation.

But President Robert Mugabe is not happy that the African Union (AU) should be dependent on the same donors and external partners for funding.

And so, as its chairman last year, the veteran leader offered 300 cows to help ease the AU's reliance on donors who come with "conditionalities".

AU Commission deputy chairperson Erastus Mwencha arrived in Harare Thursday to collect the donation which is meant for the African Union Foundation. I am here for very good news," said Mwencha.

"His Excellency the President during his tenure as chairperson of the African Union made a contribution and a donation to the private sector and as we know that last year when we had Ebola the private sector came up in a very strong way to support the African Union.

"So His Excellency also showed his commitment in that direction. He made a donation of some 300 cattle which will be a contribution to support our programmes including, for instance, building our health capacity and also strengthening our education for the continent."

According to state media, the cows are being "kept" by Kadoma businessman Jimayi Muduvuri at his Karoi farm.

Mugabe said he was happy to help the AU.

"I am happy that the gift we offered to the AU is at last received by the beneficiary,"

"I just decided that we make a gift in kind, it just struck me that no one had ever thought of a gift by way of cattle to the AU and since we are cattle people why shouldn't we also make a gift to the AU in cattle form?

Trump under attack by rivals at rancorous debate

TEW YORK - White
House hopefuls Ted Cruz
and Marco Rubio
unleashed a barrage of attacks
against Donald Trump during
Thursday's raucous Republican
debate as they sought to halt the
billionaire frontrunner's seemingly relentless march to the party's
nomination.

The three candidates exchanged some of the most heated and acerbic remarks of the entire 2016 primary cycle. They often talked over one another as they battled for supremacy in the final on-stage showdown before the "Super Tuesday" series of state wide votes on March 1.

Cruz and Rubio mounted a furious assault against Trump, blasting the frontrunner for hiring foreigners and challenging his commitment to conservative principles, but Trump largely stood his ground and swatted away the attacks.

Knowing that they need to

change the campaign trail narrative quickly or risk Trump coasting to the Republican nomination, the two freshman senators launched broadsides against the brash billionaire, who lashed out at his challengers in what quickly devolved into a shouting match. Rubio, seen by many as the pri-

mary mainstream challenger, appeared loose and aggressive against Trump. While he has hesitated to attack Trump directly on the campaign trail, Rubio seemed eager to engage and criticize his rival during the debate in Houston.

He immediately berated Trump

over his immigration positions including having once supported a pathway to citizenship for the undocumented. And he took him to task for having "hired a significant number of people from other countries to take jobs that Americans could have filled" in Trump development projects.

Rubio pointed to articles that described a 1980s lawsuit by a workers union against Trump for hiring 200 illegal immigrants from Poland to build the Trump Tower in New York.

Rubio also accused Trump of starting a "fake university" that bilked students out of thousands of dollars, and said that if the real estate icon had not received a massive inheritance from his wealthy father he would be "selling watches in Manhattan."

Trump pushed back fiercely.
"I've hired tens of thousands of people," he said in his rejoinder to Rubio. "You haven't hired one person, you liar." AP

Terrorists to citizenship

MONTREAL - Canada's Liberal government is scrapping parts of controversial legislation brought under the previous Conservative government, which gave Ottawa the power to strip Canadian citizenship from dual citizens convicted of terrorism, spying and high treason. The government of Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said on Thursday that it will restore the Canadian citizenship of anyone who had it revoked under Bill C-24, which came into effect in May 2015. One of the first beneficiaries of the new legislation will be Zakaria Amara, a member of the so-called Toronto 18 terrorist group, who had his Canadian citizenship revoked in September.

Police shoot dead 11 prison escapees

SYDNEY - Police in Papua New Guinea have shot dead 11 prisoners and wounded 17 more after a jailbreak in the Pacific nation's second largest city Lae, reports said yesterday. More than 30 men attacked two guards and fled the Buimo Correctional Institution on Thursday afternoon, with the jail chief quickly alerting police who gave chase on foot, PNG commercial television network EMTV said. Wagambie told the broadcaster. AFP

4 dead in Kansas shooting

LOS ANGELES -At least four people

were killed and up to 30 wounded on Thursday when a gunman opened fire at a lawn mower factory in a small Kansas town, police said.



Harvey County Sheriff T Walton said the number of victims could rise to as high as seven. He said the gunman, an employee at Excel Industries, located in a tight-knit community north of Wichita, was among the dead. *AFP*

Sex offenders get longer jail time

JAKARTA - Indonesia's Supreme Court has overruled the acquittals of two teachers, a Canadian and an Indonesian, on charges they sexually abused three children at a prestigious international school, and ordered longer prison terms for them, a court official said on Thursday. Canada and the United States both expressed shock and dismay over the verdict. Neil Bandeman and Ferdinant Tjiong had been sentenced to 10 years in prison last April by the South Jakarta District Court. AP

Military files, e-mails deleted

WASHINGTON - The chair of the
House Intelligence Committee said on
Thursday that personnel at US Central
Command have deleted files and e-mails
amid allegations that intelligence
assessments were altered to exaggerate
progress against Islamic State group
militants: "We have been made aware that
both files and e-mails have been deleted
by personnel at CENTCOM, and we
expect that the Department of Defence
will provide these and all other relevant
documents to the committee," Devin
Nunes said at a hearing on worldwide
threats facing the United States. AP

Dead pig painted with Merkel's name found on mosque site

EIPZIG - A dead pig with German Chancellor Angela Merkel's name painted on it was found on the building site of a mosque in the eastern German city of Leipzig, police said on Thursday.

The words "Mutti Merkel" were scrawled onto the carcass in red paint, police said. "Mutti" is the German word for "mum" and is often used to refer to the German leader.

The act is also an affront to Muslims, many of whom abstain from eating pork because pigs are considered impure animals in the faith's teachings.

"On account of the circumstances, it is likely that we are dealing with a xenophobic or racist act," police spokesperson Uwe Voigt said.

Merkel has come up against criticism from right-wing groups and within her own coalition for an open-door policy that allowed 1.1 million migrants - many of them refugees fleeing war in the Middle East - into the country in 2015.

"To symbolically compare a person to a pig and to threaten the chancellor with death is another low point and evidence of the coarsening political debate," local parliamentarian Holger Mann told dpa.

An investigation has been launched into the matter, but will initially focus on insults made to the chancellor.

The mosque's imam, Said Ahmad Arif, said he was puzzled by the act but remained defiant: "The mosque is being built." He also said critics were always welcome to speak to members of the mosque's Ahmadiyya Muslim community. DPA

'Ten days to bring migration flows under control'

THENS - Time is running out for Europe to bring its influx of migrants and asylum seekers under control, a top EU official warned amid a heated debate over national measures being taken to curb the number of arrivals.

"In the next 10 days we need tangible and clear results on the ground otherwise there is a risk that the whole system will completely break down," EU Migration Commissioner Dimitris Avramopoulos said following talks in Brussels.

His comments come ahead of a special migration summit on March 7 between the European Union and Turkey - the last stop for many migrants before reaching Europe.

The 28-country bloc expects steps from Ankara to curb the flows.

"Things are moving in the right direction," said Dutch Migration Minister Klaas Dijkhoff, whose country holds the EU's rotating presidency. But more must be done before the change in seasons improves sea conditions between Turkey and Greece, he warned.

"We cannot rest easy and wait until spring comes and then be assured that what has been done already is enough to prevent a spring surge in the influx," Dijkhoff said.

Failure to deliver results by March 7 would necessitate "other joint co-ordinated European measures," warned German Interior Thomas de Maiziere, without going into detail. Europe has been struggling to deal with a migration surge that brought more than one million people to the continent in 2015. Many are asylum seekers fleeing the war in Syria, but economic migrants have also joined their ranks. AFP

Chelsea remain unbeaten in domestic competition since Hiddink was installed as interim manager in December, a

12-game run that has taken the Blues into the FA Cup quarterfinals and helped the club move closer to mid-table in the Premier League.

Hiddink has brought much

needed stability, with the only blemish on his record the last 16 first leg Champions League defeat at Paris Saint Germain which he hopes to avenge next month

> The 69-year-old's second temporary spell at the club was always destined to draw to a close at the end of the season and reports this week suggest Italy coach Conte, whose current contract

expires after Euro 2016, has emerged as the front-runner to take charge next season.

Whether or not Conte takes over a club on the up hinges on Hiddink continuing to bring the best out of a group of players

who have recently started to show the form they demonstrated in winning the title last year.

Southampton manager Ronald Koeman, who played under Hiddink at PSV Eindhoven, believes his former manager was the ideal appointment after the departure of Jose Mourinho.

"He is always defending his players and such was good for Chelsea at that moment," Koeman said.

"He was the right man at the right moment and the players are looking more comfortable and he has given them confidence.

"I was expecting that because they have good players with good qualities. The way the manager is dealing with the team is good for this moment.

"When they changed the manager they signed Guus Hiddink

for his second spell at Chelsea and he had, in the past, had a good relationship with the play-

"He is a coach with a lot of experience at all levels and knows a lot. He has a knowledge about characters of players and how to give them that important support."

Hiddink admits his priorities lie with the FA Cup and Champions League, having effectively written off Chelsea's hopes of challenging for a place in Europe via their league position.

Their form has effectively ended any fears they may get drawn into a relegation fight, although they remain in 12th place, nine points clear of the bottom three, underlining the need to maintain recent progress.

UNICH -Wolfsburg are desperate to stop history repeating itself when they host Bundesliga leaders Bayern Munich today following Robert Lewandowski's historic fivegaul haul in the reverse fix-

The Poland striker came off the bench and sent Bundesliga records tumbling with his nine-minute blitz single-handedly propelling

Bayern to a 5-1 thrashing of Wolfsburg at Munich's Allianz Arena last September. Injury and illness mean Wolfsburg have 12 players either ruled out or struggling to be fit to face Pep Guardiola's league leaders at the Volkswagen Arena.

Bayern are eight points clear of second-placed Borussia Dortmund - and a massive 28 ahead of eighthplaced Wolfsburg.

Between them

Lewandowski and fellow Bayern forward Thomas Mueller have scored a combined tally of 39 Bundesliga goals - more than the entire Wolfsburg team. Wolfsburg's ex-Bayern defender Dante says the only way to stop Lewandowski is to cut off his supply.

"If we defend as a team and the ball doesn't come to him, then he can't really do anything," said the Brazilian.

Sunderland target five more wins

ONDON - Manager Sam Allardyce has set second from bottom Sunderland a target of five wins from the rest of the season, starting at his former club West Ham United today.

Allardyce joined Sunderland in October with the club yet to win a Premier League game this term and has guided his players to six victories including a 2-1

defeat of Manchester United earlier this month.

"We have got to find a minimum of five wins...between now and the end of the season to be safe." he told a news conference on Thursday. "We've won three, drawn two and lost two in our last seven, which has been the best run since I've been here." Allardyce took over at West Ham when they were relegated in

2011 and won immediate promotion back to the top flight. He left the Londoners at the end of last season when his contract expired, amid complaints from some fans about the team's playing style. Slaven Bilic, manager of seventh-placed West Ham, has praised Allardyce for the work he did at Upton Park and believes Sunderland can avoid the drop. AFP

"For this reason I advise my players that these are tough matches. I believe they are intelligent and

they will start with the same idea as the other matches," he said.

"Then there will be the details, which say whether you win or lose. I want to see the same concentration, the same focus and I want to see them hungry."

New FIFA Boss promises to restore nev

URICH - Gianni Infantino has become FIFA's ninth president after being elected at the world governing body's extraordinary congress in Zurich yester-

The FIFA presidential election entered a second round of voting for the first time in 42 years after Infantino of Switzerland secured more backing than pre-vote favourite Sheikh Salman bin Ibrahim al Khalifa of Bahrain in the first round, when a two thirds majority was required to win.

A simple majority of more than 50 per cent - 104 votes - was sufficient for victory in the second round. And Infantino secured 115 votes to Sheikh Salman's 88 to become the second successive Swiss president,

after Sepp Blatter. The 45-year-old lawyer is from Brig in the Valais region of Switzerland, less than six miles from Blatter's hometown of Visp. Voting for the new FIFA president went into a second round after Infantino and Salman failed to secure a two-thirds majority.

But UEFA general secretary Infantino narrowly edged Salman in the voting with 88 votes to 85.

Prince Ali received 27 and Jerome Champagne seven. To win in the second round, a candidate must reach 104 votes.

Ahead of yesterday's presidential election, FIFA voted in favour of reforms designed to repair its image and guard against future misdemeanours after the worst crisis in its near-112 history

The reforms, voted on at FIFA's extraordinary congress in Zurich, address issues of governance, accountability, transparency and diversity.

Meanwhile, Tokyo Sexwale received a standing ovation after ending his bid to be FIFA president in his final opportunity to address the extraordinary congress.

The 62-year-old South African was the last of five candidates to address the 207 voting members, who will

decide on the successor to Sepp

His charisma was on full show in the 15-minute speech, which he ended by announcing he would not take part in the ballot.

Sexwale said: 'My campaign ends today and I suspend my participation. I leave only four people.

There were 207 eligible votes (Kuwait and Indonesia are suspended) and 201 votes were cast on the reforms, with 89 percent (179 votes) in favour.

A reforms committee was established after widespread corruption was exposed, leading to the dethroning of Sepp Blatter and implicating many members of football's world governing body.

Acting president Issa Hayatou had spoken of the importance of the reforms in the lead up to yesterday's extraordinary congress, where a first new president of the world governing body since 1998 was set to be named.

Football Association chairman Greg Dyke on Thursday said the adoption of the reforms was more important than who was voted in as Blatter's successor.

Francois Carrard, chairman of 2016 reform committee, spoke of the importance of adopting the reforms in full.

But Gonzalo Boye Tuset of the Palestine Football Association called

for a delay, saying FIFA needed 'revolution not evolution', effectively saying the reforms did not go far enough.

Gonzalo Boye Tuset said: 'During a storm is not the best moment to refurbish the vote. We should wait until things calm down.1

The vote went ahead, though, with the required 50 percent turnout. And the required 75 percent in favour was exceeded after acting secretary general Markus Kattner, the interim successor to the sacked Jerome Valcke, reminded delegates of the importance of the reforms seconds before instructing them to vote.

The reforms separate political power and management functions, abolishing the 24-seat FIFA executive committee in favour of a 36-seat FIFA council.

At least six members of the council - one per confederation - must be female, while no member will be allowed to serve more than three four-year terms. Salaries will also be disclosed.

There will be greater independence - judicial bodies will in future be completely independent - and stringent integrity checks. And the number of committees will be reduced from 26 to nine in a bid to increase efficiency.

FIFA's 209 member associations, including the Football Association, and the six continental confedera-

tions, like UEFA, will be expected to adopt the reforms in due course.

Blatter was voted in on five occasions, including last May. But he stepped aside days later amid allegations which led to a six-year ban from football-related activity, which he is contesting.

His resignation prompted the world governing body's extraordinary congress in the most pivotal period of FIFA's 112-year history.

The successful candidate will serve the remaining term of office for which Blatter was elected last May, meaning there will be a further election in 2019.

Jordan's Prince Ali bin al Hussein, Sheik Salman bin Ibrahim al Khalifa of Bahrain, UEFA general secretary Gianni Infantino, and Jerome Champagne, a former FIFA deputy secretary general from France, were the remaining candidates as the first round of voting, estimated to take one hour, 40 minutes began.

A two-thirds majority (138 votes) was required for a result in the first round, with a simple majority (more than 50 percent) needed in subsequent rounds.

Sexwale's chances of success were slim, ever since his home confederation, the Confederation of African Football, announced its intention to back Sheik Salman. Infantino and Prince Ali also expect to have support from the region. Daily Mail

If found guilty, the team could face over E40 000 in fines and


