# GOOD SHEPHERD NURSES NOT PAID, ENGAGE IN GO-SLOW

DISGRUNTLED and hungry nurses at the Good Shepherd Hospital yesterday abandoned patients and convened endless meetings on their unpaid salaries.

The nurses and support staff have not been paid their salaries for September.

Normally, Good Shepherd staff would be paid their salaries on or before the 25th of each month.

Apparently, it seems to have become a norm that staff members at the hospital would complain about their delayed salaried almost on a regular basis.

On the 19th of this month, the workers are said to have come across a memo on the notice board, informing them that their salaries would be delayed.

The memo for which this publication also has a copy stated that the administration was working on making alternative arrangements to prevent a prolonged delay of the salary.

Following the memo, the workers' committee at the hospital is said to have engaged the management on the logistics of the issue.

Their meeting however failed to yield a solution to the problem as by yesterday, all staff members had not been paid. The nurses and support staff came to the decision of abandoning wards just before lunch hour and convened a meeting near the entrance point of the Out Patient Department (OPD).

During the meeting, the workers

discussed their grievances; mainly their unpaid salaries and allowances which they say were due last month. At some instances, they would be heard singing songs which stated that they are hungry and cannot work.

Meeting

In the meantime, the workers' committee was also locked in a meeting with management. Patients were left unattended, with only a few doctors in the wards.

Speaking during an interview, chairperson of the workers' committee Gifted Magongo said they were not necessarily holding a strike as they were discussing their grievances as workers of the hospital.

He disclosed that as a committee, they recently tried to engage the man-

agement on several issues, which however have not been resolved.

Magongo stated that the main issue was that workers have not been paid their salaries, something which is affecting their performance.

"We are not on a strike but we are gathered here to discuss a way forward as we have still not been paid," said Magongo.

He said the workers remained conscious to their mandate to save lives despite their current challenges.

He said their management had reported that they were working on an arrangement with one of the local banks to pay the workers.

Meanwhile, the workers had not received their salaries as at 5pm yesterday.

# Sithobelweni nurses travel to big city to deliver petition

OVER 20 nurses from Sithobelweni Health Centre downed tools and travelled all the way to the ministry of health in Mbabane to deliver a petition.

The petition delivered by the nurses was addressed to the Chief Nursing Officer, which stated the reason for the mass exodus of nursing personnel from Sithobelweni without adequate replacement since 2013.

According to the petition, in a meeting held

at Sithobelweni Health Centre on September 20, they resolved to seek an audience with the

CNO Thembisile Khumalo.

"This stand has been taken after the nurses through their unit committee have had a sequence of numerous unfruitful meetings with the institution's management about the increasing work and burden which is inversely proportional to the decreasing number of nurses dating from 2013," reads the petition.

The nurses say they are now forced to work on a schedule that has got one nurse running solo in a 90-bed capacity ward comprised of male medical surgery, male isolation, female isolation and female medical or surgical wards.

Also the nurses mentioned that they have three departments that have to be run on a 24-hour bases, being the Out Patient Department (OPD), combined adult ward and Maternity/ children wards.

"This department is sometimes left without a nurse," reads the petition.

The nurses said they have been patiently working with their eyes fixed at Mbabane for more nurses to join them at Sithobelweni, but with each day the situation is becoming worse.

"We have come to the CNO because we have seen that the nurse to patient ratio at Sithobelweni has reached a dangerous mark."

Chairman of the nurses at the Centre,

Mfundo Khumalo, said some of the nurses were left back at work to attend the innocent souls of the community.

The nurses have witnessed the past three years as the most difficult having to work under very difficult situations. In addition to that they requested an additional 15 nurses.

"We would be happy to have them by October 25 2016. It therefore means eight nurses are missing," he said.

He further said there is a shortage of houses, which sometimes makes nurses refuse to be stationed at Sithobelweni.

### Swaziland pushes for Taiwan's place in UN

SWAZILAND is pushing the UN to allocate a membership spot for the Republic of China on Taiwan in the organisation.

Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini said this yesterday at Ngwenya Border Gate when he arrived from the 71st UN General Assembly (UNGA 71) meeting, which was held in New York.

Dlamini said the country was of the view that all countries in the world should be part of UN.

"Swaziland wishes that countries like the Republic of China on Taiwan should be members of UN. The country suggested to UN that it should allocate a membership for Taiwan because" this is a big country, with 23 million people," Dlamini said.

He said the UN could benefit if Taiwan was to be a member of the organisation. The country, with the help of other African countries also pushed for permanent seats in the UN Security Council.

This, according to the premier, is in line with the Ezulwini Consensus, which was signed in 2005.

The African countries, during the consensus, agreed that it was high time that they were also taken seriously by the UN when they made their own contribution on matters pertaining to the UN. Currently, African countries are not represented in the UN Security Council. Dlamini also said they men-

This was a resolution taken by the countries in a meeting that took place on the Magarita Island, Venezuela, South America. The meeting, which ended on September 18, 2016, was attended by Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini.

The meeting was also attended by Swaziland Ambassador to the United Nations (UN) Zweli Mnisi and Swaziland Ambassador to Venezuela and USA Abednego Ntshangase.

The meeting of the heads of state of the countries was preceded by the meeting of foreign affairs ministers of the member countries of the movement.

At the end of the meeting, Venezuela President Nicolas Maduro was appointed as chairman of the movement. In his speech, Maduro called for a more inclusive UN, which should not only be reformed, it should be re-founded, with all nations on more equal footing.

# Stop Mbabane City Council subvention - Bennett

MBABANE businessman Walter Bennett says government should stop its subvention to the Municipal Council of Mbabane because its executive lacks integrity.

He said the lack of integrity was even demonstrated during the council's annual general meeting (AGM) which was held last week.

Bennett alleges that the council presented an annual report which had 'doctored' financials during the AGM.

He said amongst the reasons that prove the councils' lack of integrity was the fact the council did not give the agenda of the AGM prior to the meeting like other municipalities and even town boards.

"We just went there without knowing what was on the agenda for the meeting and the annual report was only presented during the meeting instead of prior to the meeting.

"An annual report is supposed to be available before the AGM," he said.

Bennett further said the financials that were presented in the annual report were nothing close to the original Auditors financial report.

He likened the financials that are contained in the municipality's annual report as a 'kindergarten version'.

"I had the privilege of attaining the original version of the financial report from the ministry of housing and urban development and what is contained in it is definitely different from what was presented to the rate payers in that meeting," he alleged.

Bennett further said the City Clerk failed to follow procedure as stated by the Urban Government Act Section 103 which states that "Within 30 days of the receipt of the Auditor's report on the accounts of the council for any financial

# MALAGWANE ACCIDENT VICTIMS ENTITLED TO E1M

COVER STORY

VICTIMS of the gruesome Malagwane accident that occurred on April 29, 2014 might get E1 million compensation.

This is contained in the report of a commission of enquiry that was set up by Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini.

The commission was tasked with ascertaining the actual causes of the accidents.

It was led by Ministry for Justice and Constitutional Affairs Principal Secretary (PS) Lorraine Hlophe. She was still Supreme Court Registrar at that time.

The Motor Vehicle Accidents (Amendment) Act of 1991 entitled the victims to E1 million.


The Act states that the Motor Vehicle Accident (MVA) Fund, in respect of motor vehicle accidents, should not exceed the sum of E1 million.

This meant all the victims might get a share of the E1 million.

The commission also advised that the victims should also consider help through Phalala Fund.

"In view of the E1 million ceiling set in terms of the MVA Act, the commission recommends that severely injured victims that may require further treatment should be granted special consideration through the Phalala Fund," reads the report in part.

However, the motorists who lost their cars during the accidents would The Motor Vehicle Accidents (Amendment) Act of 1991 entitled the victims to E1 million. The Act states that the Motor Vehicle Accident (MVA) Fund, in respect of motor vehicle accidents, should not exceed the sum of E1 million in compensation

not get any compensation.

"In the absence of mandatory third party insurance for motorists, there is no facility for compensating accident victims for the loss of property," read the report in part.

The commission recommended, in the report, that there should be an immediate review and preparation of legislative amendments to the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund Act to introduce "third party insurance" for all commercial vehicles.

The commission said "third party

insurance" was part of the normal social security landscape of first world countries.

Two accidents occurred on the day, with one occurring at about 15:00 hours and the other at 18:00 hours.

The accident involved two trucks whose drivers lost control along the Malagwane hill. For the first accident, no person was reported dead but there was damage to properties.

The second one resulted in three deaths, 30 motorists and pedestrians were injured.

# ...Cops, transport operators blamed for accident

POLICE and the truck operators came under heavy criticism for the accident that occurred at Malagwane.

The commission found out that the police, truck operators and drivers were all responsible for the accidents that claimed losses of civilian life and property.

"It was found that the causes of the horrific accident of April 29, was the slow recovery of the first truck.

This is partly due to the lack of equipment by the police service, such as breakdowns and jaws of life," reads part of the report.

Police officers, on the day, depended heavily on private breakdowns.

The Phinduvuke operated truck was also blame for having a poor service record it was reported to be unroadworthy on the day of the accident. Phinduvuke was also blamed for leaving its truck on the road for a long time. This is said to have caused a massive traffic pile-up on the road, which played a part in the aggravating circumstances of the second acci-

dent.

Mkhonta, the driver of the Phinduvuke truck was also blamed for a lack of experience at the time of the accident. He had been driving such vehicles for six months up until then. His attempt to move out of the moving truck's way was attributed to lack of experience.

### Blamed

Magagula was blamed for driving his truck at high speed when moving down the hill.

It is said Magagula made efforts to steer the truck from the slow lane to the fast lane, where there were less vehicles.

However, the weight of the truck is said to be the factor that worked against his efforts to prevent the accident.

Police were also blamed for failing to alert oncoming motorists about the first accident. They were also blamed for failing to properly control traffic.

"The expected leadership of the Head of the Traffic Department in Mbabane leaves a lot to be desired," reads the report.

The first accident involved a Nissan UD Combination truck, registered FSD 785 BH.

The truck was owned and operated by Phinduvuke Transport and was trading as "Take A Chance." It was contracted to Salgaocar Swaziland (Pty) Ltd to transport iron ore from Ngwenya to Mpaka. The driver of the truck was Sikhumbuzo Ceda Mkhonta. It is said, Mkhonta lost control of the truck and jumped out of it while it was still moving and it landed on the concrete embankment on the opposite lane.

The truck navigated its way down the hill and later overturned at the foot of the Malagwane Hill. The truck then blocked the fast lane to Manzini and traffic had to negotiate on the slow lane. The truck was not removed from the scene until about 18:00 hours. This is said to have caused traffic congestion on the hill.

The second accident was caused by another truck that was ferrying coal from Mpumalanga in South Africa.

The truck also lost control and it subsequently plunged into several motor vehicles that were stationary on the road. The truck was a Freightliner Argosy registered HFG 421 MP.

It was operated by Chrisilda Transport and was driven, at the time of the accident, by Wilson Magagula.

### ... Promises to take on Mbabane Mayor

MBABANE businessman Walter Bennett has vowed to take on the Mbabane Mayor Bennito Jones.

This comes after Jones allegedly refused to allow Bennett to make a submission during the AGM.

Bennett said during the AGM he

wanted to make a submission using the copy of the auditors' financial report but Jones flatly refused him the opportunity.

"He said the only submission I can make was based on the council's annual report which is not clear and



year, the Town Clerk shall (a) lay a copy of the account's duly by the auditor, together with the auditor's report before the finance committee and subsequently before the council and (b) submit a copy of the accounts, duly certified by the auditor, together with the auditor's report to the Minister," he said.

Bennett added that the original Auditors' financial report contains major issues that were altered in council's annual report.

"The report is so shallow, irregular, it contains irrelevant information and it is a waste of expenditure.

### Rating

"It states that the council has had an excellent credit rating, which is actually not true. It does not address significant matters like the issues of the employees' voluntary exist and the restructuring.

It also does not address the issue of

totally different from what is contained in the Auditors' financial report," he said.

He said he is going to take the matter up to council, minister of housing and urban development, cabinet, parliament and the human rights organisation.

"What Jones did was a violation of my rights to freedom of expression, so I will definitely take him on. He said to me he will not allow dialogue," said Bennett.

Bennett further said the council's report does not give accountability of the profit they claim to have made, the funds from the council's trust, the funds from the land sales and UDP packages.

"The councils' expenditure shows that they have enough money to operate on their own and they do not need government's subvention," he said.





Nxumalo was known for his jovial character amongst his peers and members of the public. Even though he was sickly, the whole media fraternity is shocked to learn of his demise.


Like the true soldier he was, many thought he was going to fight the sickness, recuperate and do what he loved the most, which was writing.

Nxumalo, who worked for over 10 years at different intervals in this publication, did not only inspire those behind him to have a knack for writing but also encouraged other journalists to uplift the standard of journalism.

Mbingo went on to add that Nxumalo has worked for almost all the media houses in the country, be it print and broadcast, as he also worked for the Times of Swaziland as well as

"I hope his son whom he adored very much finds comfort in the Lord, his wife and family as a whole," the chairman went on to add.

Media Institute of Southern Africa (MISA), Swaziland Chapter is also dumfounded by Nxumalo's death. Speaking on behalf of the organisation, Chairperson Alec Lushaba said the role Nxumalo played was immense and his legacy will continue to live on.

Nxumalo is a former member of MISA National Governing Council, and his passing is still unfathomable.

"We are saddned by the amount of knoweledge he had since he is one of the veteran journalists in the country, who are like historians in terms of knowing events that occurred.

As is now, such is hard to find since we have a new generation of journalists, who are still pretty much novices in terms of the information they have," Lushaba said.

He went on to add that they are mostly shocked by the veteran journalist's demise because they never thought he was going to succumb to the sickness. "Having worked together before, we always thought he was going to fight his illness, overcome and return to do his number one passion, which is writing. We hope his family finds comfort during this dark hour," he said. He highlighted that most journalists in the country had gone through the nurturing and mentoring hands of Nxumalo to be where they are today.

Meanwhile, many have described Nxumalo as a journalist who was knowledgeable in his work and always put his profession first without any compromise.

Some of his highlights include his reporting on political matters. "One of his interviews which I recall was when he asked the late Ludzidzini Governor Jim Gama on why he opted to name his dog as Daddy," said one businessman Siboniso Mkhabela.

### N CEO leads evidence against fired managers

MTN Swaziland Chief Executive Officer Ambrose Dlamini yesterday appeared before the Industrial Court to lead evidence against three fired managers.

Dlamini took to the witness stand before High court Judge Nkosinathi Nkonyane and told the court that some of the three managers who were dismissed between 2011 and 2012 did not qualify for positions under the new structure of the mobile telephone network company.

He said the company's board of directors approved a new structure which abolished some positions occupied by some of the managers and created other new posts. He claimed that the new structure also involved changing of reporting lines for some departments.

He said after the board had approved the salary structure, it was explained to the staff association and the union for the employees and they had been consulted on it even though they made minimal input towards it.

"The old structure had been in place since the inception of the company. The new structure introduced significant changes to be in line with how the business was going to operate into the future," Dlamini said.

He also stated that implementation of the new structure entailed filling the new positions and engaging the employees whose positions were affected, either by being abolished or reporting lines changed. He said the affected staff was engaged.

He claimed that the main aim was to involve every one in the new structure, but the problem was that some of the new positions needed highly qualified personnel.

He said, however, the company first invited

internal applications and encouraged the employees whose positions had been abolished to apply.

He said it was only after no suitable candidate had been identified internally that the company opted for external recruitment. He, as led by Musa M. Sibandze Attorneys and lawyer Muzi Simelane, appears on behalf of the three managers, namely, Thandie Kunene, Makhosandile Vilakati and David Mdlovu.

Kunene was employed by MTN on April 9, 2001 as a procurement and warehouse manager. She was employed until June 30, 2011.

Vilakati was employed as MIS/DBA Manager in 2010 until June 30, 2012. He had previously been employed at Swaziland Electricity Company (SEC) where he had served for 12

Mdlovu was employed on January 19, 1999, working as a service centre manager when he was dismissed. The matter continues.

It is through their effort that Council has managed to deliver service thus far.





# SANU STUDENTS SUSPEND BOYCOTT BUT...

SOUTHERN Africa Nazarene University (SANU) Registrar Stanley Ngcwane has advised the students who have engaged in a three-week strike to go back to class or face being charged with misconduct.

The message was relayed to the students through a memorandum posted on the university notice boards. The memo which is directed at students of the faculty of Health Sciences states that, students are advised that the ongoing student boycott is illegal in terms of the Student Regulations.

It further points to Regulation 3.4.1.11 which states that "a student shall be guilty of misconduct, if he/she participates in a class or University boycott/strike". "All students are hereby expected back in

class on Friday the 23rd September; 2016; failing which the University may invoke Regulation 3.5 relating to "Misconduct and Disciplinary Procedure," reads part of the memo.

SANU Students Representative Council Secretary Tiger Nxumalo said as students they had been forced by the administration to halt the strike, which he said they decided to abandon yesterday.

He said they decided to abandon the strike not because of the threats but after they were told that they would be addressed tomorrow (today) on their issues.

Nxumalo said should the administration continue to be adamant and fail to address their grievances they would resume the boycott. He said the administration of the institution was failing to address the situation but instead they were threatening the students.

He said they were told that the

strike was illegal because they never even attached any minutes in their submitted grievances. Nxumalo said even the meeting where it was resolved that students should boycott class was deemed illegal by the institution.

"The Registrar has been issuing numerous memorandums pleading and sometimes threatening students to go back to class while their grievances are being dealt with. They have also claimed the boycott was illegal, hence they were not prepared as the university to address the grievances unless students resumed classes," Nxumalo stated.

He added that it is for that reason that students decided to suspend the boycott for a while beginning from today. However, he said should the registrar refuse to address their grievances they will resume their class boycott next week.

The students engaged on a three-week long strike after they were told that they will not be getting a refund for their unused books and uniform allowances.

The strike began on the week of September 8 and has seen students involved in a heated war of words with the Dean of Student Affairs Sonnyboy Mamba.

The students stated that the problem was that the administration was failing to recognise the newly elected Student Representative Council (SRC), which it is said was elected while the students were on a class boycott.

The students saw this move as a delaying tactic, pointing out that without an SRC the students' issues will not be formally addressed.

Explaining the delay to the students, Mamba said he was still to consult with the Dean of Faculties. He told the angry

students that as an administration they were going to have a meeting where they will discuss the matter and give feedback.

The students stated that the problem with engaging in such a boycott without a formal SRC is that they end up being victimised as some are even arrested.

Chief Elections Officer
Njabulo Dlamini said the
problem started with delayed
allowances hence the students
decided to boycott classes after
they were informed that the
allowances were still being
processed.

Dlamini said soon after the allowances were paid a memo was issued informing students that after a meeting between the bursar, registrar and vice

chancellor it was decided that if students had books and uniform allowances that were not used at the end of the year, that money would be taken by the university and returned to the sponsor.

This move angered the students who said they felt like the university was cheating them of their allowances. They said this was not fair because the bookshop had no books and some of the students already had uniforms, so it would not be wise to buy a uniform while one still has the old one.

### Stated

The students stated that the university must not breach the contract they had with government because they never signed for any money to be returned to the sponsor.

The students said either the university provides them with books or gives them the money.

"We signed a contract with government and we will pay back that money," Dlamini stated.

The students have since delivered a petition to the administration containing about 13 grievances.

### Practical allowance too little - Students

ANOTHER grievance raised by the SANU students is the issue of practical allowance.

Chief Elections Officer Njabulo Dlamini said they feel like they were not being treated equally like other students from other institutions. He said students sign for a practical allowance of E10 000 but only receive a meagre E2 800.

### STATEMENT ON THE INTERIM INCREASE OF MEALIE-MEAL IMPORTATION VOLUMES FOR HOUSEHOLD USE

- 1. The Minister of Agriculture issued a press release on the, 14<sup>th</sup> September 2016 announcing an instant review of the limit of mealie meal to be imported for household consumption from 20kg to 50kg after obtaining a permit from NAMBoard as a temporal relief to the drought stricken whilst continuing to explore better ways to address the situation in the next three months.
- 2. The details of the agreement reached are as follows:
  - a. Importation of mealie meal shall remain limited for household consumption only.
  - **b.** The limit of mealie-meal to be imported has been increased from 20kg to 50kg per month per household.
  - c. This relief response shall run for a period of three months and will be reviewed to allow for an assessment of the situation within affected communities after which a decision will be communicated for the benefit of the public.
  - d. Individual importing mealie-meal for household use must apply for import permits at NAMBoard (Manzini) and at other strategic areas throughout the country as a measure to avoid the noted trend of mealie meal smuggling for trading and or resale.
  - e. The public is advised to ensure that packaging on imported mealie meal should be intact as has originally been packaged. That is if one decides to buy a 25kg mealie meal bag she may not split it up.
  - f. Given that this initiative seeks to support households that have difficulty accessing mealie-meal due to its scarcity within their drought-stricken communities, Mahamba and Oshoek borders shall remain with the 20kg limit for now.
  - g. NMC shall avail maize in depots spreadout in these drought stricken areas at the same cost as when bought from Matsapha office.
- 3. In operationalising this resolution National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBOARD) as the regulatory body entrusted with this function has to put up a permit system that is exclusive to the mealie meal, ensure these permits are obtained in key strategic borders as well. This requires setting up of office infrastructure in other borders like Nsalitje and recruitment of more staff.
- 4. In order to facilitate a smooth transition the Board of Directors at NMB agreed that the process of introducing permits be made to come into effect from the 1st October 2016 after the release of the special permits.
- 5. For this reason we wish to announce that Individual households importing mealie-meal for household shall need to have import permits which will be obtained at NAMBoard (Manzini) and at other strategic areas throughout the country from the 1st October 2016.
- Permits shall be issued in these places or borders;
   Lavumisa, Nsalitje, Mahamba, Sicunusa, Sandlane, Ngwenya, Matsamo,
   Lundzi and Mananga.
- 7. We thank the entire crititical stakeholder to ensuring sufficient availability of maize and mealie-meal in all regions. NAMBoard acknowledges the local millers who, for the past several months, have strived to not only ensure the availability of mealie meal but have also not increased its price in this period. NMC for improving his distribution network of maize to all drought stricken areas at her cost such that the prize of maize has remained the same in all depots and distribution centres.
- The National Agricultural Marketing Board remains sensitive to the drought situation and the effects it has on local communities hence it re-emphasises its commitment to working with all stakeholders towards alleviating the plight of affected communities.

# 20.5 percent Swazis suffer from obesity

### ALMOST a quarter of the Swazi population is suffering from obesity.

This was revealed by Minister of Health Sibongile Ndlela-Simelane on Monday at the Senate sitting in Parliament.

She was responding to concerns by senators who wanted to know the rate of obesity in the country. They also wanted the minister to provide details on the causes of the obesity and the diseases associated with it.

The senators also wanted to know what the ministry was doing to address the situation.

### Raised

The questions were raised in a form of a motion, which was moved by Senator Lindiwe Ngwenya. She was seconded by Deputy Senate President Ngomuyayona Gamedze, who was standing in for Princess Phumelele.

Ndlela-Simelane said the outcome she was talking about was coming out of a survey that was conducted in 2014.

The minister said the survey followed another survey that was conducted in 2011. This study revealed that 11 percent of children under five years suffered from obesity. In 2014, the same percentage was also found on children of

such an age group.

The minister added that there was a survey by the United Nations (UN) after 2014. The study, according to Ndlela-Simelane, revealed that 49.9 percent of women who are aged from 50 years upwards were suffering from this condition. Men of the same group who were suffering from obesity were at 20.8 percent.

### Adopted

Ndlela-Simelane attributed this to the lifestyle that was adopted by the Swazi nation. She also said the environment in which people were living also contributed to this. "Another problem is that most of us now do not have time to eat and we rely too much on fast foods. We also eat too much of these

foods that are considered not healthy. It was also revealed that about 10 000 food adverts are currently promoting such foods.

I will not mention them by name," she said. Such affected children who watched a lot of television to think that such food was good.

The minister said diseases associated with this condition included high blood pressure, diabetes (Type 2) and stroke. The minister said the mind was also affected by this. "The affected person can have depression and anxiety, which can cause mental disorder," she said.

### Condition

She also asked the Senators and the nation to avoid using hurtful words to describe the condition of such people because this was a barrier to treatment.

Her concern was understood by the Senators.
However, they urged her to set up workshops where the ministry could educate them on how to deal with such people. This was after the Senators had expressed their worries on the rising number of such people in the country.

They even stated that this was embarrassing and people should guard against it. They said people should know that once they struggled to see some of their body parts, they should know that something was not right concerning their weight.

### Water crisis dampening King's Vision

WITH government failing to provide water throughout the country, His Majesty's Vision 2022 could remain nothing but a pie in the blue sky.

This view was expressed by parliamentarians during a debate of a motion put forward by Nkwene MP Sikhumbuzo Dlamini, calling upon Natural Resources Minister Jabulile Mashwama to table a progress report on the preparation of a Loan Bill to Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini, aimed at providing clean and potable water throughout the country.

The parliamentarians said indications were that the natural resources ministry was not about to fulfill that national objective of providing every community with tap water, at least in the next six years within which His

Majesty hopes his subjects would be enjoying basic social needs available to first world societies.

The Nkwene legislator said he realised that the House had on several occasions debated the need for government to provide this resource to all communities without any meaningful steps being taken by the government. MP Dlamini said it was becoming quite evident that at the rate government was operated, this clean water for all dream would never be achieved even by the next parliament that would take over after them in 2018, hence the need to kick-start the process now.

MP Dlamini said the reason they demanded that the minister consider requesting a loan specifically for rural water provision was because they had noted with concern that the portfolio was faced with budgetary constraints.

Dlamini's motion was supported by Mtsambama MP Richard Simelane, who emphasised that to provide water in every community huge sums of money were needed.

Simelane said the regional development fund obtainable at the ministry of tinkhundla administration and development was not enough to cater for such projects.

Kukhanyeni MP Bongani Mabuza said they supported the motion by his colleagues fully because water provision was the only sure way to achieve the national dream transform the country to first world status. "That dream is about improving people's lives. Without access to clean water and good roads infrastructure, there is no way people could be said to be living life styles similar to the one found in first world countries," said Mabuza.

Minister Mashwama said she understood the motion and promised to bring a report on the matters raised within the stipulated 14 days.

# You are unrealistic, Jabulile tells MPs

PARLIAMENTARIANS were told that to expect government to provide portable tape water in every community was tantamount to nursing unrealistic expectations.

Natural Resources and Energy Minister Senator Jabulile Mashwama told members of the House of Assembly that for them to expect the Swaziland Water Services Corporation (SWSC) to provide water in their respective constituencies in the same manner they did in towns amounted to comparing pears with apples. The minister argued that SWSC's mandate to provide water was limited within a specified jurisdiction in terms of the Act governing their operations. Furthermore, the minister told the MPs that SWSC could not be expected to miraculously give birth to drops of water, but could deliver the service on the basis of the resource's availability. The mandate

of the SWSC, the minister said, was limited only to towns, where substantial investment on the infrastructure was done by government through the parastatal. Those funds, she said, were in turn recovered through the water tariffs charged to the beneficiaries. She conceded though that one of their objectives in the national vision 2022 was to

provide clean water to all communities. To achieve that goal, the minister said, billions of emalangeni were needed to finance such a nationwide programme. The minister also launched a veiled attack on the MPs for not disclosing that her ministry had successfully opened water schemes in some of their constituencies.

### 5-member committee to probe Lavumisa Town

A five-member committee has been selected to investigate alleged rampant corruption at Lavumisa Town, amounting to millions of emalangeni.

Somntongo MP Sandile Nxumalo said there were allegations to the effect that a simple town hall roofed with corrugated iron sheets was built at a shocking E2 million while yet another outrageous E300 000 was spent on constructing a simple toilet.

Nxumalo moved a motion that the House appoints a five-member select committee to investigate the alleged irregularities or inefficiencies in the demarcation and allocation of plots, both residential and commercial, in Lavumisa Town.

Of particular concern to Nxumalo was that some

investors had to abandon their plans to invest in the area due to non-allocation of land.

Furthermore, Nxumalo said the committee should investigate the

overpricing of the construction of the town structures and any other incidental matters.

Nxumalo said within 14 days of adoption of the report, the com-

mittee should table a report in the House. The motion was seconded by MP Sikiza Mhlungu and was eventually passed.

Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini said the motion needed to be supported because it bothered on corruption.

Dlamini said where there was non-allocation of land, it meant that development was stalled and, as a consequence, housing would remain inadequate yet it was most important component for the development of a nation.

The elected committee members were the mover of the motion MP Nxumalo, Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini, Ntfonjeni MP Sompisi Magagula, Hhukwini MP Saladin Magagula and MP Sitezi Dlamini of Dvokodvweni.

### MP Johane lashes at Masilela

AN irate Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe lashed out at his Lobamba counterpart Michael Masilela for questioning a motion he had moved demanding a drought mitigation strategy from the natural resources ministry.

MP Shongwe apparently felt Masilela was insensitive in his arguments and retaliated with an emotional accusation casting doubt on Masilela's capacity to deliver service to his Lobamba electorate.

"Look you have now taken your seat without a slightest mention of whether the Lobamba Constituency Masilela is representing was getting any service delivery as expected," he said.

Masilela had argued that in most communities in the country people did not have the luxury to demand clean water but contended with the few available drops they shared with livestock.

# Cabinet ministers must fetch water from rivers

MTFONGWANENI MP Mjuluko Dlamini said cabinet ministers must go and draw water from the nearby streams in Mbabane.

MP Dlamini said the country's general populace had

been scrambling for water in the rural areas for too long without any assistance from government, therefore, it was time cabinet and the rest of the decision makers residing in Mbabane felt the consequences of having to struggle for just a drop of water.

Dlamini argued the government officials were better capacitated on handling the matter because at least they knew they could clean the water by cooking it before use or mixing it with chemicals, using the very same methods they had been preaching to the general public.

### SD join forces to combat TB

SWAZILAND has joined forces with 17 African countries to wage war against the deadly tuberculosis epidemic.

A report tabled in the House of Assembly by Timphisini MP Sikhumbuzo Apton Ndlovu, states that tuberculosis (TB) is the world's deadliest infectious disease. MP Ndlovu attended a two-day African TB Summit held in Durban, South Africa as a delegate member from the House of Assembly. Ndlovu said the Summit was held on the sidelines of the 21st International Aids Conference and that this was an initiative of the Global TB Caucus, the first of its kind for Anglophone parliamentarians dedicated to tackling the disease. The report states that so deadly is the disease that in 2014, an estimated 1.5 million people worldwide

died from TB and 9.6 million people fell ill.

The World Health Organisation declared TB a global health emergency in 1993 but since then close to 40 million people have died from the disease. The report further states that Africa has higher rate of TB than any other world region.

"African nations are at the heart of the TB epidemic, with over double the global average of TB cases. In 2014, 2.8 million people in the African region fell ill with TB, which is a number greater than the entire population of Namibia," said Ndlovu. He said of these people, 760 000 died of the disease with just under half being a result of TB/HIV coinfection. He said over 13 000 people in Africa were also estimated to have contracted the more deadly Multi-Drug Resistant TB

(MDR-TB) in 2014, which is said to be up to 400 times more expensive to treat but can take over two years of painful and toxic pills and injections to cure.

The report further states that of the 30 high TB burden countries identified by the World Health Organisation globally, 16 come from the African region but does not include Swaziland.

Khubutha MP Njabulo Mabuza requested Speaker Themba Msibi to make it possible for them debate the report. Mabuza is chairperson for the health ministry portfolio committee and, as such, he said he had interest on the report.

Msibi assured him that now that he had indicated the willingness to debate the report, that would be made possible but could not commit himself on the date.

### Spinora fined E500 for obstructing justice

WELL-KNOWN Mangwaneni kingpin Moi Moi "Spinora" Mthethwa was fined E500 for obstructing justice.

Mthethwa is alleged to have blocked police officers from carrying out their duties at Mangwaneni in Mbabane.

It is said Mthethwa was against the idea of seeing his friend being arrested hence his decision to block the police van.

It was not mentioned in court what crime his friend had committed which resulted in police pouncing on him.

While making his first appearance before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati,

Mthethwa said he was regretful for his actions. He repeatedly told the court that he did not know what got

into him and was sorry for his wrongful and unlawful act.

"I am truly sorry your worship, I will not repeat such an offence ever again. I plead with the court to be lenient with me," he said.

Vilakati warned him about his conduct and told him to desist from doing it before sentencing him to five months in a correctional facility or pay a fine of E500.

"You should never block the police from doing their work, that is very wrong of you," he said.

On another note, Vilakati sentenced Siphelele Dlamini to a year in a correctional facility or pay a fine of E1 000 after being busted with dagga weighing over a kilogram.

However, half of the sentence was suspended for six months after Dlamini asked for leniency and further told the court that he was remorseful for his actions. He said he was forced by unemployement to sell the illegal herb.

"I was trying to support my family as I am the breadwinner at home, I am sorry your worship, I will not do it again," he said.

### Man admitted for trauma after new car smashes house

SIMON Zulu told the court that trauma got the better of him after he smashed his brand new car and in the process caused damage to a home in Mangwaneni.

According to the charge sheet, Zulu failed to control his car which veered off the road and went on to smash a house. Instead of stopping and assessing the damage, Zulu drove off and never reported the matter to the police.

"I was traumised by the accident; mainly because I was still paying for the car and the fact that it had damaged someone's home made it worse. But the main thing that frustrated me is that I am still unem-

ployed, so I ended up being admitted in hospital for trauma.

I was released on August 4, three days after the accident and I went to report it to the police as soon as I was discharged," he said.

Zulu narrateed this after Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati demanded to know why he did not report the accident to the police.

While making his appearance in court, Zulu said progress, in as far as fixing the house and his Mahindra was underway.

He was charged with three counts; that of failing to control his motor vehicle while driving at high speed and for this count, he was sentenced to pay a fine of E500 or five months in prison.

For the second count, Zulu was charged with the unlawful act of

not assessing the damage he had caused to the house he smashed onto but decided to drive off and he was sentenced to pay a fine of E500 or five months in prison.

For his last count, he was charged with failing to report the accident to the police and he was slapped with another E500 or five months in prison. However, the court ordered that his fines should run concurrently, which means he ended up paying only E500.

"Now you have to fix the home and also your car, the court will consider that," Vilakati said, before passing sentence.

On another note, Vilakati sentenced a cattle owner to five months in jail or a fine of E500 for letting his cattle stray on a public road.

# 18 000 children treated for chest infections in 3 months

UPPER respiratory infection is the leading cause of outpatients cases for children below the age of five in Hhohho health centres as it saw 18 827 children being treated in three months.

The ministry of health first quarter budget performance report noted that upper respiratory infection was top of the list of 10 leading causes of OPD cases for children below five years. The report revealed that in the first quarter, April to June there were 18 827 OPD cases of upper respiratory infection were recorded in Hhohho.

Second on the list was skin dis-

order which saw 10 488 children taken to health care facilities in the Hhohho region.

About 6 512 children were treated for acute watery diarrhoea, while 3 467 were treated for lower respiratory infections.

Other leading diseases that affected children between April and June were digestive disorders, eye infections, injury, oral health problems, lower respiratory infection (severe) and ear problems.

On the other hand, 33 091 adults were treated for upper respiratory infection, followed by hypertension.

A total of 21 934 hypertension cases were reported which shows an increase from the 16 726 cases reported for the same reporting period in 2015.





# Only one outlet gets Grade A in Pigg's Peak

OUT of the 29 food outlets in the town of Pigg's Peak only one was graded an A for cleanliness under the Public Health Act of 1969.

The Pigg's Peak Town Council had embarked on an exercise of the inspecting and grading of all retail food outlets (specialising in the handling and selling of food to the public) and restaurants within the small town.

The council's performance report 2015/2016 noted that the main benefits of the inspection and grading of the retail outlets was to promote food hygiene and safety in the town thus preventing the outbreak of food borne diseases and related food poisoning.

The report stated that Pigg's Peak had a total of 29 food outlets that specialised in the handling and selling of food to the public.

These outlets were divided into four groups based on how they were registered and how they interact and operate with the public.

The institutions were divided into supermarkets, restaurants, butcheries and grocery shops and grading was from A for being the best quality to E being subpar quality.

The report sighted that the exercise was aimed at promoting good hygiene and safety in all the food outlets and particular attention was paid to the following areas of cleanliness, temperature control, cross contamination, hygiene and food handling practises, pest control, construction and maintenance of the actual premises as well as waste storage.

### Over 900kg of solid food destroyed

PIGG'S Peak Town Council says the annual health report is also beneficial to the business owners as it enables them to identify areas of improvement over previous years.

It will ultimately help in the marketing of the businesses as customers are attracted to outlets that complied with regulations stipulated in the Public Health Act. These good hygiene regulations inturn sustain the economy of Pigg's Peak as a whole. The annual health report noted that the town council seized and destroyed 914.91 kilograms of solid food that was deemed unfit for human consumption.

Destroyed

A further 705.8litres of liquids were also seized and destroyed in accordance with the public health (food hygiene) regulations.

All water contained within school

water storage tanks at Mhlatane High School, Peak Central High School as well as Peak Primary School do not meet the World Health Organisation (WHO) drinking water standards.

The report stated that all water sampled from the seven tanks at the schools were not fit for human consumption thus the head teachers of the respective schools were advised to treat the water tanks with bleach overnight so as to kill the bacteria found inside the water.

# ...TOWN GETS E4M FROM WORLD BANK

PIGG'S Peak Town Council has received a E4 million grant from government through the World Bank by achieving maximum points in participation, transparency and accountability as well as maximum points in the project execution and service delivery categories.

The town maintained its record of qualifying annually for infrastructure grants under the Swaziland Local Government Project (SLGP), according to the annual performance report released by Pigg's Peak Town Council on Thursday

The report said the council also registered a surplus of

E560 000 and managed to increase its income by a healthy E1.9 Million in just 12 months.

According to the report Pigg's Peak total income for the year 2015/2016 stood at E13.6 Million which was an increase of E1.9 million from the previous year. The council also registered increases in all the council's other revenue streams like market fees, private properties, rates, leases and office rentals as well as grants. That increase has been achieved by the council attaining an 85 percent in the Swaziland Local Government Project (SLGP) assessment score.

# 'Ratepayers debt reduced by E400 000'

THE Pigg's Peak Town Council also managed to reduce ratepayers' debt from E1.8 million to E1.4million through competitive initiatives.

The entity did this in just 12months, through the implementation of strategic initiatives like the 'pay your rates in full and win campaign'.

According to the annual performance report, the objective of the campaign was to improve rate collection by the council by encouraging property owners to pay their rates in full and on time.

The council also offered prizes to rate payers who managed to pay thus enabling Council to finance other budget programmes and other projects.

# SOLDIER'S WEDDING STOPPED AT 11TH HOUR

WHAT was expected to be a union of two loved ones, ended badly on Saturday when a deputy sheriff arrived wielding court documents to stop a wedding for a member of the Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF).

Mthobisi Eric Mamba (soldier) of Sigcawini in the Manzini region was supposed to marry Simphiwe Dlamini of Mabhudlweni area in Mhlosheni in the Shiselweni region.

The deputy sheriff, Mathokoza Gamedze, arrived at the Franson Christian High School (Mhlosheni) to stop the wedding as it is said the supposed groom had a first wife in Sihle Ncamisile Mamba (nee Tfwala).

Tfwala and the soldier married through the Swazi Law and Custom (kuteka), on October 21, 2011 at Sigcawini.

Mamba had planned to marry LaDlamini through the civil rights, something that the first wife challenged thus she rushed to court to stop it. About 600 had come to witness Mamba and Dlamini's big

She successful challenged this in court as there was an interim order issued a day before the wedding, which was last Friday.

The sheriff arrived with police and made the announcement that the wedding was being stopped. Tension enveloped the whole

place when seconds followed by minutes and then later hours ticked by without any signs that the ceremony would start.

It is said the groom and bride were nowhere to be seen.

The police and the sheriff spent several hours explaining to the relatives of the groom that the court was stopping the wedding and anyone who would defy the order risked being locked up.

The bride and her family were at home, located a few metres away from the venue and they only heard that there was a problem when there was a delay to have them transported to the wedding venue.

The sheriff together with the police officers proceeded to the bribe's parental home where she was served with papers alerting her that she would no longer walk down the aisle with the soldier.

It is said there was grief at the Dlamini homestead when Simphiwe and others learned about the developments.

The court papers which the sheriff was armed with to stop the wedding were issued at the Nhlangano Magistrate Court where Mamba's first wife was cited as applicant was stopping the wedding.

In the papers, the wife stated that as far as she knows, her marriage

with Mamba still subsisted and therefore she would not want him marrying another woman.

Respondents in the court papers, being Mamba and Simphiwe cited as first and second respondents respectively have been given until October 11, 2016 to file their submission on why the court should not make the interim order final.

As a result of the court order, Pastor Kunene who was to officiate as marriage officer, was seen time and again explaining what transpired to those that were keen to know anything related to the issue. It is said had Pastor Kunene decided to proceed officiating and ignored the order of the court, he would risk being arrested. Some of the dignitaries at the stopped wedding included Ngwane Teacher's Training College Vice Principal Mzomba Dludlu, Senior Regional Officer who is in charge of the Hluti sub region Senamile Mbuli, Indvuna of Emchinsweni Chiefdom Bhekizizwe Dludlu and many others all who left dejected when learning that the wedding was being called off.

Well wishers and relatives alike were as shocked that the wedding would not proceed.

### Well wishers told wedding will occur sometime

"I have been requested by the Dlamini and Mamba families to apologise for keeping you waiting. There are still things that are being sorted and I have been sent to tell you that once all has been addressed, you will be alerted as to when the wedding will take place.

However, today it will not continue as there are reasons beyond our control," said the individual who claimed to have been sent by the two families to apologise.

Well wishers were advised to get meals in the dining hall before leaving.

It is said wedding cakes which were also displayed for the two love birds to first cut were taken back to the cars after it was announced that the wedding would no longer take place.

Meanwhile, there was no one who could confirm figures as to how much had been spent for the wedding. It is said a catering company had demanded an upfront payment.

"The catering company was paid in advance and we have been made

# UNISWA STUDENTS THREATEN TO MARCH TO PARLY OVER 60%

STUDENTS at the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) have been thrown into disarray as their leaders are being accused of serious crimes by the institution.

The students are now threatening to march to parliament if their issue of 60 percent on allowances is not addressed as 30 days has elapsed and they have not been given any feedback. The students are finding it difficult

to forge a way forward as their leaders cannot address them pending their appearance before the institution's disciplinary committee.

The students are seeking for answers on grievances that they delivered to the institution and government. Early last month the university promised the students responses on a number of issues after a three-week period.

This promise helped in calming down the students who had vowed not to return to class if their grievances were not dealt with. The students were also seeking for answers from the Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula about the issue of bringing back the 60 percent on allowances.

The students are now accusing government and the university of 'colluding' in a bid to oppress and silence them by victimising their leaders.

Members of the Students Representative Council (SRC) including the President Brian Sangweni were expected to appear before the disciplinary committee last week.

This was after they were accused of insubordination amongst other charges in that they defied senate's order to cancel an 'illegal' class boycott and proceeded to block traffic at the university gate at Kwaluseni campus.


However, the hearing for the accused students did not continue because the case was postponed to October 4. Sangweni said the

charges levelled against them by the university were just another campaign by the institution to frustrate the students' representatives. The students have revealed through one of their communication platforms that they intended storming parliament and demand answers pertaining their issues. The students' concern was that other students would sign for the E9 900 which they were against.

Shongwe said even last year during the same time, His Majesty passed through one of the refurbished roads.


"During the preparations of the King's visit, we were thrilled to learn that he will tour some of our projects," he said.



# SCIENTIFIC BREAKTHROUGH COMBINES HIV INTO HUMAN DNA TO CURE AIDS




TWO years ago it was just speculation, and now medical scientists at work to conquer AIDS have made real progress transforming what seemed like fiction into reality.

The bottom line is that parts of the HIV virus may be attached to human DNA to create a natural defense against AIDS. DNA is the name for the genetic code that determines how an organism develops. Humans have our DNA which makes us individuals.

### Direction

Viruses like HIV grow from the direction of their DNA also. Viruses are a species of living organisms, with DNAs that are the code that determines what an organism will be and how it grow into that being. DNA is the molecular sequence that is the foundation of our genetic make-up, and our genes determine all our features, such as the colour of our eyes and hair and whether we are more likely to fall victim to a particular disease.

When diseases strike, people either die from these viruses or survive them and become immune to them. Those who become immune have this ability to survive a virus implant-



ed in their genetic code, or DNA. It is passed on by mating with other survivors.

Other forms of life have learned to resist viruses the same way. It was discovered this year that such animals as the wallaby, bats and mice were infected by the Ebola virus millions of years ago.

This was determined by examining the DNA of these animal species. Dr. Derek Taylor in his paper published in BMC Evolutional Biology in 2010 reported how fragments of Ebola's DNA were mixed into the DNA of these animals when they were first exposed to and survived Ebola.

This occurred about 10 to 24 million years ago, before the human species existed. (Before this discovery, Ebola was thought to have appeared only 10 000 years ago.)

By constant repeated exposure to early Ebola over time, some animal species integrated fragments of Ebola's DNA into their own DNA, rather like an inoculation. With an inoculation, a small amount of a virus is injected into a person's blood.

The person's immune system then

builds a defence against the virus so that when and if the actual virus should try to infect a person, he or she will be literally immune.

By being infected with Ebola but surviving the encounter, various animal species were "inoculated" naturally when portions of Ebola, fragments of filoviruses, were "sewn" into the animals' genetic code. Afterward, the animal species would pass this protection onto offspring, and down through generations over millions of years.

This history is important because it represents a new way to think about curing HIV. By integrating bits of Ebola into their DNA, the animals millions of years before mankind made themselves immune to Ebola. Mankind has only been exposed to Ebola for thousands or on the far range tens of thousands of years, which in terms of evolution time for a species in not enough for us to adapt. This is where modern medical science comes in. By replicating the process of integrating virus fragments into the human DNA, a new way can be found to immunise a person against the disease. When the

person becomes a parent, that immunisation along with the rest of the person's DNA package will be passed on to a new generation.

As one medical commentator wrote this week, "This could now help us in developing our own defenses against a virus for which there is presently no proven treatment."

The remark was directed toward Ebola. However, HIV is a virus as well, and has its own unique DNA.

A number of obstacles must be met and overcome to create a new way to treat-disease, via our DNA. One is a better understanding of human and viral DNA. Genetic engineering is common in agriculture.

#### Resistant

Many new plant species have been created with DNA manipulated to make these crops resistant to frost or disease, or to have attributes that make them better fruits and vegetables.

However, genetic engineering faces ethical considerations when it comes to human beings.

Genetic engineering on humans is outlawed in places around the world, and is opposed by both religious and scientific groups in certain instances.

Only a thorough assurance of the safety and good and ethical use of genetic engineering will allow this branch of science to proceed from the theoretical to the practical.

One compelling argument to be made in favour of human genetic engineering is presented in this article: as a way to overcome incurable diseases.

If all other means fail to conquer HIV and no vaccine is produced to immunise a body from HIV, the argument to consider a possible (though as of now theoretical) DNA treatment will become even more compelling.


### Never waste a good crisis

NEVER waste a good crisis, they say. So let's use the crisis around the demand for free tertiary education to sort out some of our national priorities.

Free education at universities is indeed achievable without breaking the economy or sucking the small number of taxpayers completely dry and it would be good for universities, but shouldn't free (and better) basic education, feeding schemes for under-nourished children, clean water and basic sanitation for the millions of poor citizens rate as a higher priority?

The debate can help us to focus much sharper on what we spend taxpayers' money on; where we can save; which institutions we can scale down, close down or privatise.

An example: The governing party, the EFF, the trade unions and a chunk of civil society strongly believe that SAA shouldn't be privatised. But now that we're faced with



the urgent need to make every cent count, shouldn't we admit that it makes no sense to continue to support the airline financially? What value does a state-owned airline have for ordinary citizens, especially the poor who will probably never use it? Citizens should engage on where we are wasting our national resources. Some of the proposals on the table are: cut the Cabinet and the president's staff in half; scrap the

useless and wasteful National Youth Development Agency or merge it with another department; drastically scale down on politicians' and civil servants' security, parties, trips and transport; close down unnecessary foreign missions; scrap vanity projects like the Durban

Commonwealth Games in 2022; and don't spend one more cent on nuclear power stations.

Here's a sobering thought: if we add the amount the state loses annually through corruption and wastage, about R30bn, to the present state contribution to higher education, we would already have enough money to scrap university fees.

But again: if it is possible to save billions this way, shouldn't we rather spend at least some of it on the poor and on basic education? Fighting crime? Land reform?

This is also our opportunity to ask the hard questions about who should really go to university and who should do some other after-school training.

We should also now seriously investigate the advantages and disadvantages of online education – it's much cheaper and students don't need accommodation.

Another important question is whether fighting inequality should be a higher priority than the more immediate battle against extreme poverty and unemployment.


### Protestors

The small group of militant protestors on our campuses clearly believe that short-term, race-based inequality is the first priority. They're not saying much about the poor state of squatter camps or black education; their "pain" is more campus-based and their aims appear focused on the emerging middle class.

Inequality is indeed not only morally untenable, but a serious threat to our precious stability. And it is increasingly clear that if our stability comes under serious threat, it will come from the black middle and working classes rather than the poor and unemployed.

The campaign, launched on Valentine's Day 2012, began as a call to action based on the staggering statistic that one in three women on the planet will be beaten or raped during her lifetime. With the world population at seven billion, this adds up to more than ONE BILLION WOMEN AND GIRLS. On February 14, 2013, people across the world came together to express their outrage in, strikes, dances, and RISE in defiance of the injustices women suffer, demanding an end at last to violence against women and girls.

On February 14, 2014, One Billion Rising for Justice focused on the issue of justice for all survivors of gender violence, and highlighted the impunity that lives at the intersection of poverty, racism, war, the plunder of the environment, capitalism, imperialism, and patriarchy. Such an approach will need all of us here involved including Government for we can no longer turn a blind-eye to this issue that is effecting the lives of many women and girls.

# Under-funding, not protests, is driving SA universities down global rankings

CAPE TOWN - The most widely respected world university rankings have all recently published their latest results. The release of the Times Higher Education 2016-17 and Quacquarelli Symonds 2016-17 rankings have coincided with a resurgence in protests at many of South Africa's universities.

Most of South Africa's universities have dropped down these ranking tables. Some people argue that the protests - which relate to fees, access and transformation and have occurred on and off for the past 18 months - are having a direct effect on universities' global standing on rankings tables. But it's unlikely that

the protests themselves are directly affecting rankings. Instead, decades of government under-funding in the higher education sector may be at least partly to blame. The University of Cape Town (UCT), where I am a deputy vice-chancellor, has handed

a memorandum to the Department of Higher Education and Training. It states: We believe that government has not acted decisively to ensure sustainable and adequate funding to address the systemic crisis in the higher education sector.

Government has placed an undue burden on students, parents and universities to fund higher education. This may seem unfair: the government has dramatically increased the amount of money it gives to universities. But so have students. And educational inflation has played a part too. In real terms, the amount universities receive in state subsidy as a proportion of their total income has declined from 49% in 2000 to 40% in 2012.

Funding has a direct effect many of the indicators that are used to measure performance in world university rankings. With less funding, staff-student ratios rise. Top staff, who produce the most papers, leave for more lucrative salaries abroad. Universities can't afford to send their academics to many conferences, so fewer conference papers are produced. How rankings are calculated

UCT has, for some time, been able to compensate for the drop in government funding for research. (News24)

# SRAREADY TO SUPPORT SADC-EU EPA TRADE FLOWS

THE Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) has put in place institutional arrangements that will support the trade flows between the European Union (EU), Swaziland and Southern African Development Community (SADC) Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) states.

The agreement is expected to come into full effect on October 1. According to the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade Principal Secretary Jinno Nkambule the country did not only ratify the EPA, but also deposited the ratification instrument with the EU in Brussels.


Adding, he said government, through its embassy in Brussels also signed the joint undertaking for administrative cooperation which would allow all African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries to be cumulative.

Nkambule was speaking during a meeting organised by the SRA and the ministry of commerce, industry and trade on the implementation of the SADC-EU EPA.

The meeting was held yesterday at the Happy Valley Hotel, Ezulwini.

It was aimed to present the EPA to local stakeholders as well as provide training on rules of origin and registration requirements for entities that aim at accessing the preferences under this agreement.

SRA Commissioner General Dumisani Masilela said the SRA seeks to ensure that they create a

conducive environment to ensure that the business community will realise all the benefits of the agreement.

"Therefore, the customs department has put in place the institutional arrangements that will support the trade flows between the EU and Swaziland/SADC EPA states," he said.

The agreement is development oriented and guarantees
Botswana, Lesotho, Namibia,
Swaziland, South Africa and
Mozambique countries duty free and quota free access for all their products, except arms and ammunition, into the EU market.
The customs legislative unit,

responsible for the registration of exporters made a presentation of the administrative procedures during the meeting which included the application, certification, completing the certificate of origin, certification procedures and dispute settlement.

Masilela confirmed that the customs department has the capacity to administer the Protocol on Rules of Origin which was the cornerstone of the agreement.

"Rules of origin in simple terms is the 'economic' nationality of goods traded in commerce. In order to qualify for the EU preferential tariff treatment, the

goods must comply with the Rules of Origin annexed to this agreement."

The rules of origin makes it easier to put together products from components from other countries without risking losing one's free access to the EU market. When producing and exporting canned fruit, for instance, the fruit can be now harvested in one country, then preserved and canned in another. This develops value chains across the beneficiary states.

Masilela said the SRA would endeavor to use a regional approach in the implementation of the agreement to ensure uniformity and harmonious implementation of the agreement.

He said the agreement and annexes of the agreement would be posted on the SRA website to make them accessible to everyone.

"The SADC EPA exporters' manual, which provides an overview and explanation of the rules that apply and will be used by the exporters, will also be posted on the SRA Website. The blank Certificate of Origin is available for those companies that would meet the Rules of Origin. Regular engagements will be conducted to continue capacitating the industry on the Administration of the Rules of Origin."

Masilela said the SRA would also collaborate with other agencies to avoid duplication and delays at the border.

I therefore would like to take this opportunity to invite all stakeholders to collaborate and coordinate with the SRA to turn this opportunity into realities," he said

### SRA COMMISSIONER NAMES OPPORTUNITIES IN SADC-EU EPA

According to Delegation of the EU Economist Nomfundo Dlamini, who represented

Ambassador Nicola Bellomo, the EU remains the most lucrative market in the world. The EU boasts of about 28 countries with a total population of about 500 million consumers and contributes about a quarter to the world's Gross Domestic Product.

Masilela said the key opportunities for the country in the area of trade in goods included duty free, quota free market access into the member states of the EU, accessing EU products at more favourable terms through the

reduction of duties which would result in getting the best products at the best price.

Adding, he said another benefit would be creating value chains by utilising the cummulation provisions under the agreement not only with the SADC EPA States and the EU, but also with other Africa, Caribbean and Pacific states.

"To give a practical example, a manufacturer in Swaziland can source inputs from Namibia or any other member state or from the EU or from any other least developed country that benefit from this arrangement with the EU and would still benefit from the preferential market access," he said.

"This creates the opportunity for Swaziland manufacturers/exporters to put together components from various countries without the risk of losing their free access into the EU. Done correctly, this has the potential to create employment in the country," he further stated.

# TOMATO FARMERS POCKET E1.7m FROM NAMBOARD

TOMATO Farmers received the lion's share of E1.7 million from the National Agricultural Marketing Board (NAMBoard) payments to farmers in the first quarter of 2016.

According to the Ministry of Agriculture first quarter performance report NAMBoard paid farmers a total of E1.7 million compared to E1.5 million in the last quarter.

"The increase was mainly attributed to the rains incidences towards the end of the summer, which encouraged farmers back into production.

However, these were short lived and the situation of fresh produce is projected to reduce again in the second quarter and the quarter of the year," the ministry of agriculture said.

The ministry said the highest sourced produce during the reporting period was tomatoes with 51.7metric tons (MT) or 51 700 kg bought at a total value of E296 809 with a yield of E5 741 per MT.

"This was followed by butternut at 61MT with a value of E217 545 and cabbage at 119.2MT with a value of E394 985," reads the report as part.

Total

The ministry said a total of 366.2MT of produce was purchased from contracted farmers during the quarter against 268.69MT in the last quarter. In its commentary the ministry said food commodity prices have continued on an upward trend that was witnessed during the last two quarters.

"However, this quarter showed fur-

ther increases in prices of bulk commodities, reaching a peak in April and started to drop slightly by the end of the quarter.


"The main reason for the downward trend at the latter end is mainly an increase in availability, especially for commodities such as tomatoes beetroot and cabbage which are key market drivers and indicators for the country," reads the report in part.

The ministry of agriculture said the reduced commodity prices are projected to hold, and even move further down during the next quarter as more stock is coming into the market, both locally and regionally.

However stock levels will start to decrease significantly by the end of August and price increases will once again be anticipated.

### NMC to deploy officers in potential high yielding areas

THE Ministry of Agriculture has instructed the National Maize Corporation (NMC) to become more involved in both maize production and marketing.

Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati said this year the NMC would be deploying about ten of their own officers in the areas of high maize potential to specifically advise farmers on maize production.

"This initiative will also require that silos are constructed in these areas to capture the local harvest and allow easy access to the market by maize producers. This initiative, it is hoped, will boost the levels and quality of maize produced in these areas," he said. The minister was speaking during a demonstration of lime application held recently at Ekupheleni.

Vilakati said with regards to the issue of marketing the ministry has felt that planning for production alone without markets was not enough.

"This initiative is aimed at augmenting the number of extension workers in critical areas of maize production. An opportunity such as this one affords all farmers access to technical expertise," he said.

The minister further urged farmers to go out and take advantage of this

government initiative.

"I believe farmers by nature are not beggars; if such a mentality still prevails among you then we might as well forget attaining food security in the home. I therefore implore all farmers present to ask oneself what is it that he or she has contributed to the food security initiative now that government has availed its subsidy program," he said.

Vilakati said government was aware that the weather has not been favourable for a number of years, "that I know and we sympathise with you, but what about the current scenario where rains have been predicted and the issue of input has been

solved.'

He said government has arranged that the tractor service to continue serving farmers in the country.

"Although this service can never be adequate for the needs of the farming community, the ministry has availed 300 tractors this year at the disposal of the farming community together with all implements," he said.

Vilakati said in the regions government has also made available tractor drawn conservation agriculture implements for people to access.

"The rates have been kept constant even this year and farmers will pay the same amounts paid the previous year," he said.

### THERE IS NEED TO SAFEGUARD AGAINST GOODS INFLUX - JINNOH

MINISTRY of Commerce, Industry and Trade Principal Secretary Jinno Nkambule says there is a need to safeguard against a goods influx that may subject the country's industries to unfair competition.

He was speaking during a meeting organised by the SRA and the ministry of commerce, industry and trade on the implementation of the SADC-EU EPA.

Unlike the old agreement or the interim agreement that the country had with the EU which was unilateral, the SADC-EU EPA signed in June was reciprocal. This means that the SADC member states, SACU countries and Mozambique have also opened their market to the EU.

However, Nkambule said the protection could be done through a number of provisions within the SADC-EU EPA agreement.

The agreement allows Southern African countries to protect budding and fragile industries, while the EU opens up its markets far more, and far faster, providing free market access to the African countries involved.

challenge for the country, "these includes the issue of standards, changes in legislation, limited production and trade capacity, export promotion, to name a few."

He said while the agreement has a number of cooperation provisions which aim at counteracting some of these difficulties, others would be solely the responsibility of government.

Nkambule thanked the EU delegation for constantly offering advice and support.

"I have no doubt that the SADC EPA countries, including Swaziland; stand to benefit from the numerous trade opportunities that come with such an agreement. Such opportunities exist through exports and imports of goods to and from the EU. In future we anticipate the liberasation of trade in services and investment under the same EPA," said Nkambule.

For the past few years, the country has enjoyed a positive trade balance with the EU, however, Nkambule said that decreased in 2014 by 33.9 percent.

On the other hand exports to the EU declined from 8.5 percent in 2014 to 6.1 percent in 2015, while imports increased from 2.0 percent to 4.3 percent in 2014.

"It is therefore, needless to say that this is an indication that the SADC-EU EPA can be used to counteract this trend by focusing on the possible opportunities."

Meanwhile, EU Ambassador Nicola Bellomo expressed thanks to the ministry of commerce, industry and trade and the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) for convening the meeting.

He was represented by the EU Delegation Economist Nomfundo Dlamini.

Bellomo said the event was part of a series of events aimed at facilitating the implementation of the newly signed SADC-EPA and was a vital component in raising awareness of the existence of the agree-

He announced that they would also support another business

seminar aimed at strengthening the successful implementation of the agreement.

"In this agreement, implementation is key to ensure that the agreement actually delivers and achieves the primary goal, which is that of sustainable development building on principles of rule of law, respect for human rights and democracy enshrined in

the Cotonou Agreement of 2000," said the ambassador. He said the EU would be ready to assist Swaziland to overcome challenges in putting the agreement in place.

Bellomo said accessing the global market place and developing export capacity was considered key to building sustainable industries and the economies.

He said the EPA came about to solve industry developmental issues which were a structural issue across the continent.

"The calls to bring the preferential trade arrangements between the EU and African countries such as Swaziland, into line with the rules of the World Trade Organisation (WTO) were getting stronger and stronger."

Heads of State of the African, Caribbean, and Pacific (ACP) community and the EU agreed that a new trade relationship was necessary and that it should be based upon the development and economic growth of the ACP partners.

"We look forward to seeing more customers at our next auction on the October 30, 2016," he said.


The auction manager explained that Swaziland Motors would conduct car auctions every last Sunday of the month.

# CAPITEC LIFTS EARNINGS GROWTH BY 19% POINTS

JOHANNESBURG - Capitec Bank has yesterday pointed to the fastest client growth in its history as it announced that profits had increased by 19 percent, from R1.5 billion to R1.8 billion, in the six months to the end of August.

The bank, which has recently faced allegations of reckless lending, said active client numbers had grown by 648 000 to a total of 7.9 million in the period under review.

Chief executive Gerrie Fourie attributed the client growth largely to increased branch distribution in key malls and a strong brand proposition of simplified banking and value for money. The total number of branches is now 751, with 280 of them open seven days a week.

#### Accusations

All eyes had been on the bank's results after accusations in early May from consumer champion Summit Partners that it was guilty of opportunistic practices, including disguising payday loans.



"Given the challenging economic conditions, we continued to maintain our conservative credit model and tighten our credit-granting criteria. This resulted in granting fewer loans and increasing the provision for doubtful debts," Fourie said yesterday

Capitec said arrears had increased by 44 percent year-on-year and by 11 percent from February to R2.6 billion, while arrears to gross loans and advances increased to 6 percent.

Still, headline earnings a share were up by 19 percent to 1 517 cents, and an interim dividend of 450 cents was declared, representing a 20 percent increase on the same period a year before.

# New US president can't kick SA out of AGOA

DELAWARE - Whether the next president of the United States is former first lady Hillary Clinton or business magnate Donald Trump, the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) is set to remain in place until 2025.

This is according to Delaware Senator Christopher Coons, the man who pushed for South Africa to be part of the renewal of AGOA.

"I don't expect, after this election, either president to go back and sort of reach in AGOA and tear it up," Coons told a small group of South African journalists ahead of the first presidential debate between Clinton and Trump.

#### Export

AGOA is an American law originally passed by the US Congress in 2000, which allows eligible African countries to export a wide range of goods to the US duty free.

"It is part of, I think, a positive US-Africa trade agenda that sees opportunity of growing

trade for both the United States and Africa," he said.

Coons said championing AGOA was not politically easy for him.

"It helps a lot when I am specifically able to articulate in a way that benefits my state."

Delaware is one of the country's biggest producers of broiler chickens, making poultry the backbone of its agricultural sector and contributing US \$4.6bn to the state's economy.

### Hyundai workers start first full strike in 12 years

SEOUL - Tens of thousands of unionised workers at South Korea's Hyundai Motor staged their first full strike on Monday for more than a decade after negotiations over a wage increase stalled.

Nearly 50 000 workers at Hyundai Motor's three plants across the country -- including the main one in the southern city of Ulsan -walked off the job throughout Monday, said a spokesman for its labour union.

The day-long stoppage is the first full strike at the company since 2004. The workers would also stage a sixhour partial strike until Friday, the union spokesman said.

Hyundai's union has staged partial strikes every year since 2012, including nearly 20 such stoppages this year, demanding higher wages and

better benefits.

The latest demands from workers include a wage increase of 7.2 percent as well as bonuses for employees that would in total be worth 30 percent of last year's net profit.

Hyundai is South Korea's biggest automaker and, along with its smaller affiliate Kia, forms the world's fifth-largest carmaking group.

### Union and retail motor sector to talk wages

JOHANNESBURG -Unions and employers in the retail motor sector are expected to meet this week to discuss a revised wage offer that could avert a strike at fuel pumps and some component manufac-

Despite the National Union of Metalworkers of SA (NUMSA) now agreeing that a deal could be structured over three years, its demand for a rethink of how collective bargaining is structured could still be a sticking point.

The union wants employer bodies to agree to a process to discuss reorganising collective bargaining, which is seen as fragmented.

Negotiations were at a "sensitive stage" NUMSA general secretary Irvin Jim said last Friday.

NUMSA dropped a requirement for a one-year deal after it reached a three-year pay agreement in the vehicleassembly sector earlier in September with manufacturers including BMW, Ford and Toyota.

The agreement will effec-



tively give workers a 35 percent increase over three years. The 2016 deal will see workers receive a 10 percent increase in the first year and increases of eight percent in the second and third years.

This is down from the 11.5 percent deal agreed on in 2014, but NUMSA said it had "won the war", given the country's depressed economic climate.

The deal includes a transport allowance of R1 200 a year, to rise annually, and a shift allowance of 20 percent in the first year, 21 percent in the second, 22 percent in 2018

and 23 percent in 2019. It also includes a short-time bonus and a housing solution.

### Investors eye nuclear vs political power in SA

CAPE TOWN - Political power and nuclear power in South Africa are currently key topics of interest to investors, emerging markets economist Peter Attard Montalto of Nomura said on Monday.

"We reiterate our existing views on political power not having shifted, though some risk of erosion of 'foundations' is occurring," explained Montalto.

He added that investor interest in South Africa's nuclear plans is currently piqued, not so much about what he calls the end point, but rather about the process of getting there and what it does fiscally and to politics.

"Nuclear tendering will likely consume political capital into yearend as it grinds forwards," said Montalto.

Regarding the nuclear issue, Montalto said the Department of Energy has indicated it expects to move to hard tendering - the stage which requires National Treasury to sign off - by year-end. In his view, in reality this may well move to the first quarter of next year.

"As we have commented previously, this puts much more immediate pressure on President Jacob Zuma on what to do with National Treasury," said Montalto.

"Our view remains that nuclear as a technology is of interest, but that on a fully-loaded life time cost comparative basis versus gas especially makes little sense. Similarly, such mega projects cannot be brought in on time and on budget and without rent extraction within the SA context."

He added that increasing energy efficiency of demand and

improved supply efficiency from Eskom, with Medupi and Kusile coming on stream alongside renewables, will add around 12.5GW of electricity - and that is even before one gets to Coal-III and gas tenders in a low growth environment.

"We are still skeptical about whether nuclear will happen – by which we mean a new nuclear power station that will add electricity to the grid," he said.

### 'Dire academic consequences if classes don't resume next week'

CAPE TOWN - UCT vice chancellor Max Price has warned that the academic consequences would be dire should classes not resume next Monday as planned.

In a communiqué on the university's website, Price said the institution hoped to reopen the campus without the use of security next Monday.

A meeting of the UCT senior management team decided that classes would resume on October 3.

Students began protesting two weeks ago, calling for the university to reinstate students who had been suspended, interdicted, or expelled following

the Fees Must Fall protests. They also called for the university to institute a Shackville truth and reconciliation commission (TRC) within this year.

This after students in February erected a shack on upper campus as a symbol of the struggle for student housing and financial exclusions. The shack was later demolished by security.

Price called on the UCT community to use this week to "engage with one another on ways to begin reconciliatory engagement, to address transformation issues, and to make meaningful progress in this regard". Price on Monday

reportedly met with heads of academic departments to discuss the current campus situation and share ideas.

He is set to meet with other vice chancellors this week and "will seek engagement" with the Minister of Higher **Education and Training Blade** Nzimande.

On Monday, the campus remained open, with the exception of the library.

Price previously said the decision to temporarily halt operations was taken in order to protect the university's property, while not escalating the violence by bringing private security onto the campus. News24

The mortuary received the body of her mother, Barbara Carolus, a few weeks ago and efforts to locate her jewellery since then have been unsuccessful.


"When the family members arrived to identify Barbara's body ... all her belongings had been apparently secured and booked in at the mortuary. However, they were not available to us at the time," she





"He would have said "You're absolutely off your head," she said. Joy agreed and said plenty of people have called her mad for globetrotting at her age, but she has no regrets.


"I've had people tell me I'm brave, mad, crazy... and that they've always wanted to do the things I have," she said.

### Islamic State militants kills five civilians

EL-ARISH - Egyptian officials say Islamic State militants have killed five Egyptian civilians and dumped their bodies, wearing orange jumpsuits, in a restive corner of the Sinai Peninsula. They say two of the men were beheaded and the others shot in the head over accusations they had collaborated with the Egyptian army, which is fighting the insurgents in the area around the city of Rafah and the town of Sheikh Zuweid, where the bodies were found. The officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorised to release the information to journalists. AP

### Migrant shipwreck death toll rises to 168

CAIRO - Egyptian rescue workers have recovered 168 bodies from a migrant shipwreck off Egypt's Mediterranean coast, the health ministry said Sunday. Survivors have said up to 450 migrants were on board the overcrowded fishing vessel headed to Italy from Egypt when it keeled over last Wednesday off the port city of Rosetta. Egypt's military has said it rescued 163 survivors and that recovery attempts were continuing. The International Organisation for Migration said most of those rescued were Egyptians but they also included Sudanese, Eritreans, a Syrian and an Ethiopian. The tragedy sparked an emergency cabinet meeting and also topped the agenda of talks between President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi and Egypt's security chiefs on Saturday. AFP

### Moroccan threatened over cartoon posted

RABAT - Well-known Moroccan cartoonist Khalid Geddar has asked for police protection

after being threatened for reposting a drawing that led to the murder of a Jordanian writer, he said. Geddar, who runs the satirical magazine Baboubi, reposted on

Facebook on Sunday, as a posthumous tribute, a cartoon previously posted by Nahed Hattar who was shot dead outside an Amman courthouse earlier that day. Hattar had been facing charges over the illustration he posted on Facebook under the title "God of Daesh" (the Islamic State group) showing a bearded man in bed smoking with two women lying on either side, and addressing God as a servant. Any depiction of God is prohibited under Islam. *AFP* 

### Yemen deports 220 African migrants

ADEN - Yemeni authorities on Monday deported at least 220 African illegal immigrants, mainly Ethiopians, from the southern port city of Aden, security officials said. The migrants had been rounded up over the past two weeks and were put on a ship bound for Somalia, from where they apparently came, an official in Aden said. The boat left from the port at Aden's refinery. Hundreds of illegal migrants have arrived in south Yemen over the past few weeks despite the ongoing war that has ravaged the country. In Shabwa province, east of Aden, authornes have arrested more than 500 African migrants over the past two weeks, security chief Awad al-Dahboul said. AFP

### Shell Nigeria refuses to confirm attack

WARRI - Shell Nigeria is refusing to confirm a report by Niger Delta militants that they have bombed its Bonny oil pipeline in the south, crippling its exports. Friday night's bombing breaks a month-long ceasefire between militant groups and the government and comes days after repairs from an earlier attack had allowed exports to resume. Shell spokesperson Precious Okolobo says he cannot comment on the incident. AP

# Algeria plans bank privatisations as oil money dries up ...plan will open the door for foreign investors

ALGIERS - Algeria plans to allow its dominant state banks to list on the local stock exchange to help develop its financial markets and diversify sources of funding after the oil price slide, a senior financial official said.

The plan will open the door for foreign investors to acquire controlling stakes in banks, reversing a rule requiring Algerian firms to keep a majority shareholding in any partnership with foreigners, the official told Reuters.

Algeria's six government-run

banks account for most of the sector's assets. French companies such as Societe Generale and BNP Paribas have the strongest presence among foreign-owned banks already working in the country.

OPEC member Algeria's economy has been largely based on a state-run and centralised system since its independence from France in 1962 and it remains reliant on an energy sector that still provides 60 percent of its budget. But the oil price drop since 2014 has put Algeria under financial


pressure, forcing the government to trim spending and search for alternative financing sources. "The era of \$100 a barrel is over.

We have no choice but to change our policy," the official said, asking not to be named because they were not authorised to speak to the media. "Reforms will move slowly, but there will be no step backwards." With more than \$130 billion in foreign exchange reserves and little foreign debt, Algeria is in better shape than other oil produc-

ers such as Venezuela.

However, it has been forced to push up taxes and increase subsidised gasoline and diesel prices, scaling back a vast welfare system that has in the past helped ease social tensions.

Advocates of the 51/49 ownership rule and tight foreign exchange controls say they help protect Algeria's strategic sectors after an experimentation with privatisation in the 1990s. But critics say such curbs stifle growth and investment. *eNCA*

### Ali Bongo to be sworn in as President of Gabon

LIBREVILLE – Ali Bongo was to be sworn in yesterday as Gabon's president for a second seven-year term, his office announced, three days after his election victory was controversially validated by the constitutional court.

The ceremony will be held at the seafront presidential palace in Libreville, the presidency told AFP Monday. It gave no details of who had been invited or the time of the event.

"You don't get sworn in unceremoniously in secret," commented his main rival Jean Ping's spokesman Jean-Gaspard Ntoutoume Ayi, ironically.

Bongo's victory in the August 27 vote was confirmed on Saturday by the country's top court, which dismissed opposition claims of vote fraud.

But it received a cool reception internationally including from the African Union and the United Nations, while the European Union voiced regret that the election count had not been transparent enough.

Violence initially erupted on August 31 after Bongo, 57, was first declared the winner

Demonstrators set parliament ablaze and clashed with police, who made a thousand arrests. Opposition figures say more than 50 people were killed. The government has given a toll of three dead.

Ping, 73, who came in second in the vote, lashed the court's ruling as a miscarriage of justice and declared himself "president elect". A career diplomat and a former top official at the African Union, he had filed a legal challenge after Bongo was declared the winner by a mere 6,000 votes.

Ping had asked for a recount in Haut-Ogooue province, where 95 percent of voters in the Bongo family stronghold were reported to have cast their ballots for the president on a turnout of more than 99 percent. *AFP*

# peace deal

CARTAGENA - The Colombian government and the leftist FARC rebel force signed a historic peace accord Monday to end a half-century conflict that has killed hundreds of thousands of people.

President Juan Manuel Santos and the leader of the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC), Timoleon "Timochenko" Jimenez, signed the deal at a ceremony in the Caribbean city of Cartagena, prompting loud cheers from the crowd which included numerous international dignitaries. The signing followed a four-year process to end Latin America's last major armed conflict. The accord remains to be ratified in a referendum next week.

"Today we are experiencing the happiness of a new dawn for Colombia." President Juan Manuel Santos wrote on Twitter ahead of the signing. He called it "a new stage in our history, one of a country in peace!" The two signed with pens made out of real bullets for the occasion. The guests at the signing included UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, US Secretary of State John Kerry, the Vatican's Secretary of State Pietro Parolin, and an array of Latin American leaders including Cuban President Raul Castro. The 2,500 attendees wore white for the 70-minute ceremony.

The European Union decided to suspend the FARC from its list of terrorist groups once the agreement is signed, EU foreign policy Chief Federica Mogherini said in a statement on Monday.

The suspension will allow the temporary lifting of sanctions linked to FARC's presence on the list, including the freezing of assets. AFP

# Colombia and Clinton, Trump face-off in first presidential debate

**NEW YORK - Hillary Clinton and Donald** Trump bickered and traded insults in a fiery US presidential debate Monday, as they aggressively pitched their case to tens of millions of American voters.

With the White House rivals in a dead heat six weeks before election day, Clinton from the get-go painted her Republican rival as out of touch and having a tenuous relationship with the truth, willing to say "crazy things" to get elected."

Trump claimed his rival 68year old Democrat, Clinton does not have the "stamina" to be president, hitting at the Democrat after a recent bout of pneumonia. "I said she doesn't have the stamina. And I don't believe she does have the stamina. To be president of this country, you need tremendous stamina," Trump said.

Clinton fired right back: "Well, as soon as he travels to 112 countries and negotiates a peace deal, a ceasefire, a release of dissidents... or even spends 11 hours testifying in front of a congressional committee, he can talk to me about stamina."

"You live in your own reality" said Clinton, who accused Trump of launching his political career on a "racist lie" - the birther conspiracy theory that questioned President Barack Obama's citizenship.

Trump, who faces tough questions about his suitability for the Oval Office, started out with a more restrained tone - he even ditched his red power tie for a more statesmanlike blue. AFP

Her charges of racism stemmed from an age-old complaint that he had supported 'birther' conspiracies questioning Barack Obama's U.S. birth and therefore his eligibility to be president. And she leveled charge after charge at the Republican in an attempt to frame him as an unrepentant chauvinist, aided by a question from moderator Lester Holt about a one-time comment that Clinton lacked 'the look' to be president. "This is a man who has called women pigs, slobs and dogs," Clinton said a similar challenge to one Trump faced more than a year ago from Fox News Channel anchor Megyn Kelly at the first GOP primary debate. (AP)

### OVER 90% OF WORLD BREATHING BAD AIR - WHO

GENEVA - Nine out of 10 people globally are breathing poor quality air, the World Health Organisation said vesterday, calling for dramatic action against pollution that is blamed for more than six million deaths

New data in a report from the UN's global health body "is enough to make all of us extremely concerned," Maria Neira, the head of the WHO's department of public health and environment, told reporters

The problem is most acute in cities, but air in rural areas is worse than many think, WHO experts

Poorer countries have much dirtier air than the developed world, according to the report, but pollution "affects practically all countries in the world and all parts of society", Neira said in a statement.

"It is a public health emergency," she said.

"Fast action to tackle air pollution can't come soon enough," she added, urging governments to cut the number of vehicles on the road, improve waste management and promote clean cooking fuel.

Tuesday's report was based on data collected from more than

3 000 sites across the globe. It found that "92 percent of the world's population lives in places where air quality levels exceed WHO limits".

The data focuses on dangerous particulate matter with a diameter of less than 2.5 micrometres, or PM2.5. AFP

### Aleppo battered as Russia slams 'unacceptable' rhetoric

ALEPPO - Syria's Aleppo faced worsening food and medical shortages and warplanes again pounded the city as Russia condemned what it called "unacceptable" Western rhetoric after allegations of war crimes.

A fresh wave of intense air strikes battered Aleppo's opposition-controlled east, said an AFP correspondent in the city facing its worst violence in years.

During an emergency session of the UN Security Council, US ambassador Samantha Power accused Russia of "barbarism", while the British and French envoys went even further.

"War crimes are being committed here in Aleppo," Francois Delattre of France said, while Britain's envoy spoke of bunkerbusting bombs and more sophisticated weaponry unleashing a "new hell" on Syrians. "It is difficult to deny that Russia is partnering with the Syrian regime to carry out war crimes," said Britain's Matthew Rycroft.

Spokesperson Dmitry Peskov denounced "the overall unacceptable tone and rhetoric of the representatives of the United Kingdom and the United States, which can damage and harm our relations".

### Taiwan shuts down as Typhoon strikes

TAIWAN - Taiwan went into shutdown Tuesday as the island faces its third typhoon in two weeks, with thousands evacuated, schools and offices closed across the island and hundreds of flights disrupted. Typhoon Megi is expected to make landfall in eastern Taiwan later yesterday but is already bringing widespread violent winds and torrential rain as it nears the island. More than 5 000 people have been evacuated from their homes and around 2 000 are in shelters, according to the Central Emergency Operation Centre. More than 650 000 households have lost power due to the typhoon so far. AFP

### Opposition calls for anti-govt demonstration

CARACAS - Venezuela's opposition Monday urged its supporters to join a mass demonstration on October 12 against government moves to avoid a recall referendum this year that could force snap elections. It was the latest call to protest in a tense political crisis in the South American oil exporter, hit by food shortages and violence." We call for a special day of mobilisation on October 12," said Jesus Torrealba, spokesman for the opposition Democratic Unity Roundtable (MUD), in a speech in Caracas." We will peacefully overrun the streets in the whole of Venezuela." AFP

### Portugal's Guterres leads in UN chief race

NEW YORK - Portugal's former prime minister Antonio Guterres maintained his lead in the race to become the next UN secretarygeneral following a fifth straw poll by the Security Council on Monday, diplomats said. Guterres, who served as UN refugee chief for 10 years and was prime minister from 1995 to 2002, picked up 12 votes of encouragement, two 'discourage' votes and one 'no opinion,' the same result as the previous informal vote. It was the fifth time that the 67-year-old has taken the number-one spot in the contest to succeed Ban Ki-moon, the former South Korean foreign minister who steps down on December 31 after 10 years as the world's top diplomat. AFP

### Uber plans self-flying drone taxis

NEW YORK - If you summon an Uber in 10 years' time, you will probably get a car that drives itself. But then again, you may not be travelling in a car at all. The taxi-hailing app is working on technology that would allow passenger drones to fly its users short distances around cities. He raises the prospect of a future in which skylines are dotted with Uber aircraft shuttling commuters back and forth. Jeff Holden, Uber's head of product, told technology website Recode that the company was researching "vertical take off and landing" (VTOL) technology. Instead of the helicopter-style rotor blade drones, VTOL aircraft have fixed wings like planes, enabling them to fly silently, while taking off and landing vertically. The Daily Telegraph






THE much anticipated 'Yebo Gogo Yebo Mzala' arts festival is coming with more in store as people will have a chance to take instant photos in a photo booth.







# JAMES ADMITS 'PERSONAL GOAL' TO MATCH JORDAN

...as Cleveland Cavaliers star gears up for new NBA season

LOS ANGELES - Now that LeBron James has won a championship for the ages, he's set a loftier goal. Catching Michael Jordan.

Long flattered to be mentioned in the same company with Jordan and other NBA greats, James has been hesitant to publicly acknowledge that he wants to be remembered as the greatest in league history.


'It's a personal goal,' James told The Associated Press on Monday. 'I just never brought it up. It's my own personal goal to be able to be greater than great. I think that should be everybody's personal goal.'

James became a three-time champion when he helped end Cleveland's 52-year title drought with a historic comeback from a 3-1 deficit to Golden State in last season's finals.

On Monday, James discussed a variety of topics during a 10-minute interview with the AP after he spoke at the Cavs' media day.

James touched upon the fear he feels as a parent in light of recent police shootings and violence, his longevity and relentless drive to win and what impact All-Star Kevin Durant's signing with the Warriors will have on him

James has revered Jordan since he

was a kid. Like every other young basketball player in America, he wanted to be like Mike.

He modelled himself after No 23 on the court and followed some of Air Jordan's moves off it as a businessman and sneaker-wearing, multi-million dollar corporation.

James has often rejected the obvious comparisons between him and Jordan,

but shortly after winning it all this summer with the Cavs, he told Sports Illustrated that 'my motivation is this ghost I'm chasing. The ghost played in Chicago.' Jordan's spirit has consumed James and continually fueled him. His desire to match the Bulls legend, who won six championships, shouldn't be viewed as anything unusual.

# Lambie ready to play for Boks after three months of headaches

PRETORIA – Springbok flyhalf Pat Lambie, who woke up with a headache every day for three months after being knocked out against Ireland in June, said he was ready to return against Australia on Saturday.

"I'm thrilled to be back, very excited to be included in the group again. I've missed being part of the Springboks, so it is wonderful to be back," Lambie said ahead of the Rugby Championship test at Loftus Versfeld.

"It has been quite frustrating sitting on the side, especially for how long it took to get better again. But thankfully I've been looked after well off the field," he told a press conference on Monday.

Lambie was picked by new coach Allister Coetzee for his first test in charge against Ireland in Cape Town in June but was

poleaxed early on by a tackle and has since played a single, provincial rugby match for the Sharks.

He said migraines he had after the knock from Irish flanker CJ Stander left him listless and bereft of energy.

"The thinking was that the trauma and the stress of the knocks against my head triggered a constant or chronic migraine. I had a low grade migraine for, I guess, three months," Lambie said.

"I was waking up every

morning with a headache, sore eyes, low energy and really not feeling up to much. But thankfully the doctors looked after me, I saw a few neurologists, had a few courses of medication and I've come right now. "Everyone has cleared me and they're all happy that I'm playing again. 

Messi has been sidelined for three weeks with a groin injury but Barca were unaffected by their leader's absence last Saturday, firing five goals past Sporting Gijon in a show of force ahead of their second Group C match. Their opening game in Europe was even more impressive as the Spaniards crushed Celtic 7-0 to move top of the standings on goal difference ahead of Manchester City, led by their former coach Pep Guardiola.

Barcelona have scored 18 goals in four games since losing 2-1 at home to Alaves on Sepember 10, with Neymar and Luis Suarez in fine form. "I have different kinds of players and that gives me a lot of options," Luis Enrique said. "Depending on who we are playing and the players I have available, I will pick the ones that I think are right for the situation.

"To lose Messi means that football loses. With Messi we are stronger, but we will continue being strong,"

he said. He rested several players on Saturday, including Ivan Rakitic, Andres Iniesta, Jordi Alba and Javier Mascherano.

For Barca keeper Marc Andre ter Stegen it will be an emotional return to the club he left in 2014.

"I had a fantastic time there and played for the club my entire career apart for the last two years," Ter Stegen said.

"Borussia are my old love and that will remain so but I identify with Barca 100 percent and on the pitch there is only one club for me."

They will need that focus if they are to get maximum points in Germany and snap Gladbach's 11-match winning streak at home in all competitions following their 2-0

victory over Ingolstadt on Saturday. Coach Andre Schubert will have Raffael back, the Brazilian having recovered from an adductor injury.

Fit-again creative midfielder Mahmoud Dahoud is also expected to be in the squad after playing against Ingolstadt, as Gladbach look to bounce back from their opening 4-0 defeat at City.

"We are happy to be playing against one of the world's best teams," said defender Oscar Wendt. "And it is even better that they are coming to us on Wednesday (today)." "But we are no fans of Barcelona and do not want to play a supporting role on the night. We want to give it all we have and make something special out of it." reuters







"The doctors have not yet fully examined the injury of the player but he is still under assessment and at the moment we can't rule him out nor


confirm his participation in the game," he said.




