

# FOUR WOMEN FOUND WITH CLOSE TO E800 000 CASH

FOUR Mozambican women were nabbed with E789 000 in hard cash at Siteki.

According to reliable sources, the women drove into the country with the money through the Lomahasha border gate and it remains a mystery how they 'dodged' security there.

They were apprehended in Lugongolweni by members of the Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF).

It could not be established where the Mozambican women were taking the money to, but it is suspected they had come to do shopping.

Laws of the country stipulate that if you are carrying a large sum of money, it must be declared at the entry point.

However, the women did not although they had the declaration forms.

USDF Deputy Public Relations Officer Lieutenant Nkosinathi Dlamini confirmed the arrest.

He added that the women's vehicle was controlled by soldiers.

"Yes it is true that we apprehended wom'n with that amount of money, but were later released after producing declaration forms," Dlamini said.

On another note, the deputy PRO further stated that livestock rustling remains a nightmare for the army.

According to December 2016 and January 2017 USDF statistics, livestock rustling is on the rise.

As the USDF continues to patrol the country's borderline to stop illegal activities occurring there, in January alone there were 34 livestock rustled to Mozambique and South Africa.

The month of December as reported by the USDF statistics, was one of the

months where the rustling was said to be at its peak.

"Two men rustled 14 goats into the Republic of South Africa, but with the cooperation of RSA police, we were able to control them inside RSA," the Lieutenant said.

Intercepted

Dlamini went on to add that 20 cattle were also intercepted at Mnyana in Maphungwane (Lubombo) whilst being rustled into Mozambique and were handed back to their rightful owners.

"Unfortunately there was no arrest made except the unlawful immigrants. These livestock-rustlers and drug peddlers ran off leaving the livestock and dagga behind.

"Those with undeclared goods were only taken to Swaziland Revenue Authority Posts for taxation," Dlamini revealed.

He further revealed that dagga weighing 280kg, was controlled at the country's borderline.

"The controlled herb was worth over E196 000," he said.

He said 45 illegal immigrants (Mozambicans and South Africans) were controlled at the country's different borders yet most of them were Mozambicans, who were handed over to various police stations.

# MGWAGWA BLAMES IT ALL ON STIFF SA LAWS

THE struggle to get study permits at the South African High Commission has been attributed to the stiff immigration laws that were recently enforced by the South African government.

Speaking on the struggles facing South Africa bound Swazi students, the Minister of Foreign Affairs Chief Mgwagwa Gamedze said as a ministry they were not idle as they have approached the commission on how things can be worked out.

The soft spoken minister said the struggle faced by the Swazi students was a result of the new immigration laws which the ministry of home affairs in South Africa enforced.

Gamedze described the laws as stiff and said government would continue to engage the South African government in a quest to loosen the laws.

"The pile-up is a result of the new immigration rules that South Africa has implemented, these have resulted in the commission having more requirements in place for the applicants," he said.

Gamedze said as a ministry, they were engaging their South African counter-

parts as far as the laws were concerned because they were too stiff.

"We have engaged them on how the situation can be mitigated and how we can help them on the matter," he said. He said what must be understood is that this was seasonal, so working on the matter was not that easy.

"Students only apply for permits in January making this a seasonal occurrence," he stated.

Gamedze explained that when they

were engaging them, the commission had stated that they were over stretched.

"During our discussions with them they brought it to the fore that they were overstretched as their staff could only help 40 to 70 people per day," he said.

The minister said they had offered to help the commission where they needed help.

Gamedze said because this was the first time the commission had experienced such, they hoped that going forward, they would be better prepared.

In the past month, thousands of South Africa bound students have been spending nights at the commission's premises in a quest to apply for study permits.

Information gathered by this publication is that the commission only serves 50 people per day hence, people slept at their premises to make the first 50 for the day.

The students have also complained of the increase in requirements when applying for study permits and have further accused the commission of adding requirements willy-nilly.

The students have also questioned the commission's decision to open for two hours a day when they were aware there were thousands of them queuing outside.

# Locked out Swazi TV Finance Director bulldozes way back

SWAZILAND Television Authority's (STVA) Acting Director Finance and Administration Abel Simelane bulldozed his way back to the television station yesterday.

This comes after Simelane was on Wednesday mid-moming dragged out of the TV station premises by a security guard from Big Man Security Services and further directed to cease coming to STVA from yesterday pending acquisition of the instruments of service as per the CEO's instruction.

A witness said yesterday morning, Simelane reported for duty before 8am only this time he came on foot, not driving. It is said he approached the television station's gate with a straight face and found that the gate was locked.

"Simelane asked the Big Man Security Services' security guard to open the boom gate which he refused to do.

"He then told the security guard that if he thinks by closing the gate he will be kept away from his work place, he must think again. He said this while bending under the boom gate and making his way to his office," the witness said.

This act is said to have stunned the television station's staff as they watched in disbelief especially after the drama that had taken place the previous day.

"Simelane went straight to his office and it was work as usual for him," it is said.

When this newspaper called the television station, and asked to speak to Simelane the receptionists transferred the line straight to Simelane's office and he answered the call.

Comment

Simelane however, refused to comment on the matter and referred all questions to the Corporate Affairs Manager Mncedisi Mayisela who was not in the office.

On Wednesday the Acting Director Finance and Administration was presented with a letter directed to make sure that all assets of the station with and in his custody should be surrendered to the office of the corporate affairs manager. The assets include a car and office /safe keys in his possession.

# Zondle shortage; Schools break early

SOME schools around the country break early due to the shortage of zondle (food).

This is despite the ministry of education's assertion that food in the schools is available.

General Secretary of the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Zwelithini Mndzebele has revealed that their office received a number of reports that some

schools break earlier than usual owing to food shortages.

He said the pupils cannot stand the long hours without having anything to eat.

"Some of the pupils come to

school without having eaten anything and they rely on the feeding programme at school for food. They cannot stand the long hours on empty stomachs, hence the principals cut the days short so they can concentrate and be able to grasp something," he said.

Mndzebele said schools have had a bad start.

"Imagine the impact the shortened classes will have in the long term work, pupils will be behind schedule on school work and this will mean a bad ending," he said. "The ministry must understand that most of the store rooms in the schools lack ventilation. Imagine the state of the food that have been kept in those store rooms for almost two months," he said in reference to the ministry's stance that food was handed out last year and it should still be available.

Money

The secretary general further said the fact that government has not yet paid for the free primary education (FPE) in the schools is not helping as principals have no

> money to buy supplementary food while waiting for government to deliver.

> The ministry of education and training delivers about four 50kg of rice, six to 10

50kgs of mealie-meal, depending on the size of the school and beans in each school to last a month.

Mndzebele said this is usually not enough but the schools' principals then use the FPE money to buy more food.

Minister of Education and Training Phineas Magagula said any school affected by this must report the shortage through their respective regional education officers (REOs).

Magagula, however, said the ministry will action the zondle issue so that everything returns to normal at the schools.

# CHAOS AS 2 000 WORKERS ATTACK, STAB BOSS

POLICE had to be called yesterday when over 2 000 workers at Juris Manufacturing company in Nhlangano went wild and attacked their bosses, which saw one of them being rushed to hospital after he was stabbed with a sharp object.

The factory manager identified as Steven Westhuizein, was lucky to escape alive as the workers bayed for his blood.

In what at first started looked like a normal working day, the workers did the unthinkable just when they were preparing to start getting down to serious work at around 7:30am.

It all started when one of the male workers was called to the office where he was dismissed.

The employee was confused as he had not expected it and he allegedly reacted angrily, demanding explanations. It is claimed that in the heat of things, Steven, the factory manager, refused to entertain any questions as he had made a decision. It is said he decided to throw a cup of tea at the employee who wanted to know why his services were being terminated. The office then became a boxing ring as the employee insisted he was not going to leave until he was furnished with a proper explanation on why he was dismissed.

The employees heard about what had happened and all hell broke loose.

The workers decided to leave their workstations and wanted to see what was happening to their colleague. With other employees not at all prepared to listen to anything, drama unfolded at the factory as some of the employees reached for Steven and he was slapped, kicked and even punched all over the

As he was looking for a chance to flee he was stabbed with a sharp object believed to be screwdriver or a pair of

scissors used by the employees when going about their work. There was a stampede when the employees had to find their way out as they feared something worse was likely to follow as word had started circulating there were moves to have the factory set alight.

The employees, even when outside the factory, ran amok and even a vehicle that was seen approaching from the distance said to be used by Steve, was turned back.

### Hidden

It had to be hidden in a nearby bush next to Crucifix where two occupants were found making calls, probably alerting relatives or the directors of what had transpired.

With the situation now out of control and employees chanting and dancing, police arrived armed to the teeth. Some were armed with riffles and others with sjamboks.

However, the employees were seemingly not at all ready to find themselves having to be pushed out by force as they remained by the gate, taking orders from their representatives.

A group of other workers confronted our news team demanding to be given the camera but others rebuked them warning the media was not supposed to be attacked as it was their 'mouthpiece' which they would use to make the world know about their challenges.

Police also came to the rescue of the media personnel.

Long serving Human Resources

Manager of the company, Elmon Ndlovu, said he was not sure what actually sparked the violence.

He said it was resolved that the employees should return to work while all their issues were looked into.

### Grievances

"We agreed with their representatives that work should continue while all the grievances submitted are addressed using the right channels and platforms. We expect all of them back tomorrow (today)," said Ndlovu.

Ndlovu also confirmed that the factory manager was injured but he could not specifically say how he got injured other than stating it was during the skirmish that took place.

'Yes Steven, I heard he was injured and had to be rushed to hospital. He was fortunately treated and discharged. I was not able to see the nature of injuries he sustained," said Ndlovu.

Others said Ndlovu himself was not spared when the workers attacked Steven as he was allegedly assaulted.

However, Ndlovu denied such claims saying he was not assaulted.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba, confirmed that police had to rush to the company to monitor the situation during the riot.

He said he also heard that one of the managers was attacked and was injured.

"It is true there was riot at the said company but police were able to control the situation. So far no one has opened any case on what took place,"

# ...Workers want factory manager, HR dismissed

THE over 2 000 workers accused the factory manager Steven Westhuizein of being a racist.

The workers alleged that Steven was the reason of the unrest that broke out yesterday where the company's operations were brought to a standstill.

The workers alleged that Steven used vulgar language.

The workers said Steven must be fired as he was no longer in good terms with most of them because of the language he uses. "He calls us with all sorts of

"Working with him is something we can no longer tolerate. He has pushed us to a corner and we do not want to see him

again here could be.

For a long time we have been stomaching the treatment he subjected us to. He does not treat us like human beings and this is the same style used by whites against blacks in SA," alleged the work-

They said a majority of them were casuals, which was one of the concerns that sparked the chaos. Others claimed they have worked for over five years but were still not full time employ-

Others said Steven's style of management was questionable as he did not want to be advised on anything, including when reminded about the country's labour laws.

"You get fired anyhow here. At times, he fires 15 people a day. Even today, he wanted to fire some of the employees and it led to the chaos.

He does not respect the labour laws of the country. There is no guarantee that tomorrow you can still be around as your services could be terminated anytime," alleged the workers.

The workers also want the human resources manager dismissed as they accused him of being a fail-

They also questioned the qualification of the incumbent HR, Elmon Ndlovu.





# PARLY READY TO WELCOME KING - PM

PRIME Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini feels Parliament is fit and ready to welcome His Majesty King Mswati III for its opening today.

The premier said this when he was inspecting the preparations of the opening of the fourth session of the 10th Parliament yesterday.

The PM was impressed with the conditions he found in Parliament and expressed hope that the event would go as planned.

"We thank His Majesty for giving us the day of the event early because this gave us time to adequately prepare for it. It is imperative that when he speaks to the world tomorrow (today), he does so in befitting conditions," Dlamini said.

Dlamini arrived in Parliament at 12 midday, just after the arrival of Senate President, Gelane Zwane. He entered through the north gate and went into one of the offices in the main Parliament building, where he stayed for sometime.

At about 12:30, he was then led to the marquee, where some of His Majesty's guests will be sitting during the proceedings of the event.

This is where many performances are expected to take place. He was briefed by those tasked with the job of decorating the marquee. They told him that the job was almost done.

Clerk to Parliament, Ndvuna Dlamini also told the premier that the job was almost done in the marquee. The air conditioners were already connected and the tables were already set. The place showed that it was ready to wel-

come dignified guests.

After inspecting several places within Parliament premises, Dlamini was then taken to the conference room. There, he was given a briefing about the availability of the two most important commodities: water and electricity.

This called upon leaders of the companies that supply the country with such commodities to brief the head of government about what they had done.

Swaziland Water Services Corporation (SWSC) Managing Director Peter Bhembe assured the premier that his company would supply water throughout the event. "In our view, all is set from our side as SWSC. We have tried to ensure that even if our system is disturbed, water continues to be supplied in Parliament during this event," Bhembe said.

Swaziland Electricity Company (SEC) MD Meshack Kunene also assured the prime minister they had prepared several power stations to ensure that electricity was constantly supplied to Parliament during the event. "Mantenga Power Station supplies Parliament with electricity. If problems arise, we will ensure that we make use of other stations like Ezulwini, Malkerns, and Matsapha Power Stations," Kunene said.

The MD went on to say they would use two generators in case of power blackouts.

The briefing was graced by Senate President Gelane Zwane and her Deputy Ngomuyayona Gamedze. Speaker of the House of Assembly Themba Msibi and his Deputy Esther Dlamini were also present. Minister for Natural Resources and Energy Jabulile Mashwama was also present. So was acting Minister for Public Works and Transport Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza.

# Ejubukweni School, community receive E310 000 water project

Ejubukweni

FOR years, Ejubukweni community had to drink water from a well that had filthy substances found in it like used condoms.

This is beside the fact that they shared the water with livestock.

However, this is a thing of the past as the community now boasts of a E310 000 water project, which has been funded by two international donors; Taiwan Fund for Children and Families and the Moss Foundation from Australia.

This was revealed by one of Ejubukweni High teachers, Victor 'Mavikana' Dlamini during the official hand over of the school and community water project. Dlamini revealed that the community can now enjoy clean and healthy water after being forced to drink water, where its source had used condoms lying around it. "We once went up the mountain, at the top of the stream we found used condoms, which did not only shock us but forced us to seek help to get clean and safe water," Dlamini added.

Thanks to the Taiwan Fund for Children

and Families and the Moss Foundation, the community can now enjoy clean water. The project, which began in November 2015, was officially handed over yesterday at the primary school.

"As you can see, our children are now not only healthy but beautiful, thanks to the safe and clean water they now drink," Dlamini joked.

Taiwan Fund for Children and Families donated E310 000 towards the project, as stated by its Water Project Manager Grace Nhleko. Druce Jameson of Moss Foundation in Melbourne, Australia has been in Swaziland for 31 years. He stated that the small foundation was specialising in providing communities with clean and filtered drinking water.

"We have been handling water pro-

jects in the country for close to 15 years, we are a low key foundation, which provides cost effective water projects for different communities in the country, the money is donated by willing individuals in Australia," Druce said.

Meshack Mnisi, a representative of *Indlunkhulu* stated that this project has solved some of the issues the community had. "We used to share water with animals, this project has helped the community greatly, yet there is more that we still need to be assisted with as a community, so we seek for help," he said. Mabuza further applauded the community for joining hands and working hard towards the success of the project.

# VIP Security fails to stop writ of execution

ONE of the leading security companies in the country, VIP Security Services, yesterday had its application to stop a deputy sheriff from attaching a company vehicle, dismissed by the Industrial Court.

The deputy sheriff from the Manzini region had attached the vehicle in order to execute a writ for defraying E21 707.76, which was in respect of a security guard's payment after his services were terminated.

Despite that the matter had been heard at the Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC) for arbitration, where the arbitrator ruled in favour of the security guard and that VIP should pay a sum E21 707.76.

Money

The security guard, Mavimbela was employed by VIP in January 2007 and he remained in employment until December 31, 2015 when his employment was terminated.

CMAC arbitrator Velaphi Dlamini handed down arbitration award on March 22, 2016, an award which was in favour of Mavimbela, with VIP being ordered to pay the

said amount, which was payable at the C M A C offices.

Both parties were represented during the arbitration process and VIP was fully aware of the arbitration award and that the amount was to be paid on the stipulated dates.

It was not until VIP

failed to pay the said amount that Mavimbela instituted an application before the Industrial Court to have the arbitration award registered, with VIP being served with application, an application which was not opposed and the Court granted the application in favour of Mavimbela. Thereafter, Mavimbela issued out a warrant of execution to have the company vehicle attached and sold by public auction in order to defray the costs and the deputy sheriff had already started the processes as the vehicle has been attached, hence VIP ran to court to try and stop the writ of execution.

In the meantime, VIP had filed a review application at the High Court seeking an order reviewing and setting aside the arbitration award that was handed down by the CMAC on March 16, 2016.

# GOVT VIOLATING DVULADVULA COURT ORDER - SNA

IN a matter of utmost urgency, the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) has expressed concern over the ministry of public service's continued violation of a court order to the effect that school heads of departments (HODs) be paid on a larger scale.

This follows coming into effect of Circular No. 1 of 2016 dubbed 'dvuladvula' that was initially recommended by the consultants engaged by government for salary review of civil servants.

During an urgent application filed by SNAT against the ministry of public service at the Industrial Court yesterday, lawyer Sabelo Masuku, who is representing the teachers, expressed this

The ministry has been cited as the first respondent, Principal Secretary Evart Madlopha as the second and the attorney general as the third respondents, respectively.

According to Masuku, following an order issued by the Industrial Court to the effect that the heads of departments be paid on a Grade E1 scale, the respondents have continued to violate same by paying the teachers their salaries on a Grade D3 scale.



Masuku stated the matter was urgent on the basis that the respondents, for the past months have been paying the applicants contrary to the circular initially recommended adding the application could have been brought sooner as the applicants were trying by all means to solve the issue amicably by approaching the relevant authorities.

In his affidavit, SNAT President Freedom Dlamini said the application to have the ministry comply with the order of court, was urgent to obtain substantial redress from the court by mandating the respondents (ministry, Madlopha and AG) to act in line with the court order and the settlement agreement between the parties.

"It is denied that the circular adhered to the collective agreement by both parties as it is changing the scales per the consultant's report and that was agreed upon by the parties," lawyer Masuku, further submitted.

He said should this be denied, the respondents should submit proof thereof since no addendum is known, nor was it brought before or placed before the parties, including other members of the team.

This, Masuku said, was actually a fabrication by the respondents and such an addendum was never there at the time of signing of the collective agreement which was made an order of the court.

Masuku, in his submissions before Industrial Court Judge Nkosinathi Nkonyane, said he came prepared for hearing of the matter and the respondents had been given enough time to file their heads of argument.

This was after lawyer Nhlanhla Dlamini from the attorney general's office applied for a postponement of the matter since he had not had enough time to file his heads of argument.

Dlamini said the matter was supposed to be heard in December last year but due to national duties, it did not continue since he had to attend same.



# Education ministry still uncertain on Matric saga

THE ministry of education and training is still uncertain on the final verdict on whether schools offering Matric will be allowed to write the examination, come November.

It emerged last year December that the South African Department of Education had written a letter to the ministry of education and training notifying the country that schools that offer Matric will not be allowed to write their examination.

This sent pupils and parents into and the qualification received on panic mode as they were left confused on what would become of them.

Minister of Education and Training Dr. Phineas Magagula, said the ministry sent a letter requesting extension of the deadline to their South African counterparts.

"We are still waiting for the reply from the South Africa Department of Education. We are hopeful we will a positive reply on the matter at hand," said the minister.

In South Africa, matriculation (or matric) is a term commonly used to refer to the final year of high school

graduating from high school, although strictly speaking, it refers to the minimum university entrance requirements.

Students who fulfil certain requirements (an achievement rating of four Adequate Achievement, 50% - 59%) or better in four designated subjects) in their International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) Form Five results receive a matriculation endorsement.

This endorsement is the legal minimum requirement for admission to a Bachelor's Degree at any South African university.



# E32M SOLAR POWER PROJECT KICK-STARTS NEXT MONTH

WHILE government looks on possibilities of making the country self-reliant on electricity production in the near future, two Siteki based organisations are already two steps into the vision as they will be kick-starting a solar power project worth over E32 million next month.

The project which is situated at Matsetsa, is pioneered by Wundersight Investments and Buckswood UK. Apparently, this will be the second project after another which was completed last year at Mzilikazi.


The project, has an output of 850 killowatts, almost 10 times the one at Mzilikazi, which has a 100 killowatts output.

Coordinator of the project, Sandile Simelane first reported that the Mzilikazi sub-station has been fully functional since last year in March.

The solar power station generates electricity and supplies it to the Swaziland Electricity Company.

This is one way of generating power which has been highly commended by environmentalists as it uses the sun, without any chemical usage.

Simelane said they had already started working on the Matsetsa sub-station

with fencing recently completed.

He also disclosed that the solar panels have also been delivered into the country.

The project will be overseen by three engineers from Spain and New Mexico in the United States of America.

Simelane said they have also partnered with other financial institutions like Swazi Bank and SIDC which have pledged to pump in a certain amount of money which cannot be disclosed for now.

He reported that the completion of the project would see a greater part of the

Lubombo region using electricity which has been generated through the solar system.

Simelane said the project was expected to be complete by September this year. Worth noting is that the country currently imports over 90 per cent of electricity from other countries which includes South Africa. In fact, during the peak of the drought, the country was reported to be importing 100 per cent of its electricity.

The solar power system is therefore expected to work as a major boost in electricity supply.

# Matsapha Municipality dragged into E64 000 mess

MATSAPHA Town Council has been dragged into aE64 000 mess as a construction company is demanding payment for construction works whose services were not paid for.

The Matsapha Council has in fact been cited as the second respondent in papers filed by AVEX Technical Works, while Consortium Loss Adjusters is the first respondent.

### Business

The construction company, AVEX Technical Works, is duly registered and as such having its principal place of business at Matsapha industrial site, while the first responded is also duly registered and incorporated according the company laws, having its principal place of business at Mbabane.

According to AVEX, in the month of January 2016, they entered into an oral agreement

• AVEX Technical Works demanding payment of money for renovations from Consortium Loss Adjusters acting on behalf of municipality

with the Consortium who was acting on behalf of Matsapha Council in which agreement, AVEX was represented by Sambulo Masuku, while Consortium was represented by Frederick Ndiriwepi.

### Money

In terms of the parties' agreement, AVEX was to effect inter alia works and renovations on the Matsapha Town Council main offices, works that covered roof covering, beam filling, replacing of barge boards, plastering and painting of damaged offices.

"The plaintiff as per quotation submitted and attached hereto, would be paid by defendants a sum of E71 250 upon satisfactory completion of the works and which sum would be payable at a sum of E7 250 by the second respondent with the balance of E64 125 whol-

ly payable by the first respondent," AVEX stated in its papers. To the above end, AVEX

To the above end, AVEX completed the said works and to the satisfaction of Consortium and the town Council and duly presented its invoices and made the requisite demand for payment through a correspondence dated August 2016 in which the town engineer advised Consortium of the satisfactory completion of the works.

However, to date, Consortium has still not paid the E64 125 balance and still remains indebted to AVEX, rendering the company in breach of the agreement reached by the parties in that notwithstanding the fulfilment of the contractual obligations, to date Consortium notwithstanding lawful demand, still fails, refuses and or neglects to pay the outstanding amount of E64 125 and which sum is now wholly due and payable.

It is for that reason that AVEX has approached the court and prays for an order in the following terms, payment of the E64 125 by Consortium, interest at nine per cent per annum calculated from date of issue of summons, cost of suit and further or alternative relieve.

# SENIOR MAGISTRATE IN UNCOMPROMISING MOOD OVER CHILD MAINTENANCE CASES

SENIOR Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini was in an uncompromising mood when dealing with child maintenance cases on Wednesday.

Dlamini emphasised the importance of children's interests while also insisting both parents had to contribute equally. While dealing with a number of child maintenance cases, she made it clear she was not interested in the drama that saw the parents separating, saying she only cared about the child maintenance.

The applicants who were demanding money from defaulting fathers were not let off the hook too, as they were asked about the amount they were asking for. In fact, the senior magistrate asked them to be transparent on how the money would be used each month.

Dlamini simply had no time for games in her court as she sternly warned those who hid behind a litany of excuses they would face the wrath of the court. This method left most

women disappointed as they saw the amount t h e y applied for being slashed. Dlamini further advised the applicants to approach the court

knowing exactly the expenses for the



children, so they demand an appropriate fee when before court.

Simphiwe Mnisi was amongst the applicants who saw the initial money she demanded being slashed by the uncompromising senior magistrate. She was in court to ask for an order demanding that the father of her child, Ncamiso Mavuso, should contribute E900 on monthly basis.

However, Mavuso told the court he could only afford E250 per month as he was dismissed from work on Tuesday.

Mnisi's efforts to try and oppose Mavuso's statement were thrown out of the window by Dlamini who then ordered the respondent to fork out E250 per month as child maintenance until he has found another job.

"The child is attending pre-school and E1 600 is needed as school fees,"

Dlamini ordered both parents to pay half the amount for pre-school.

SIFISO Malaza was asked by the court how he earns a living after he told senior magistrate he was struggling to contribute towards the upbringing of his child mainly because he was currently unemployed.

The court simply did not entertain his statement as he was told he was able to survive himself hence he needed to also provide for his child.

Malaza then told the court he would be able to contribute E300 per month instead of the E1 500 demanded by his former lover.

On the other hand, Zanele Dlamini told the court she needed the money for expenses such as school fees, day care, transport to school and food for the

Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini understood the breakdown but was not convinced with the amount demanded as she said the expenses did not amount to the money she was demanding. She further told the applicant to contribute as well as she was also in gainful employ-

However, the parents to a four-year-old child saw their matter being postponed to next week after the court learnt that Malaza was actually employed and he was only hid-

> ing it before court to avoid paying maintenance for his

> Malaza also told the court the child was two years old and thus conflicted with the statement made by the

applicant. Hence, Dlamini ordered the parents to come with an immunisation card or birth certificate when appearing before court next week.

Malaza left the court with a big smile while the applicant seemed less pleased, even though she thanked the court for being given a chance to produce proof.

Malaza had told the court he earned a living through odd jobs.

MOSES Setota pleaded with the court not to issue the order of contributing E3 000 per month as he had other children to look after.

Setota told the court the child maintenance demanded by Nomsa Zulu was not only steep but also above his salary as he alleged to be earning E2 800 per month.

Setota said his other five children were based in Mozambique.

He told the court instead of forking out the money, he wanted the two children to be under his custody. He said he was not happy that they are staying with their mother's new husband. He also was capable of looking after his own children, he noted. However, the court dismissed his application and told him he was applying at a wrong platform as the day was solely focusing on child maintenance cases.

"You have to approach the right office and apply to have the children under your custody.

You are here for not supporting your children and we should focus on that, for now you are given a chance to either accept or oppose the amount demanded. But you have to contribute," Dlamini said.

Setota could not tell the court how much he would afford; hence Dlamini postponed the matter to next week whereby the respondent is expected to come with his proof of earnings and birth certificates for all his other children. "The court will then decide how much you have to contribute," Dlamini concluded.

# 'I did not know my child attends school'

SIKHUMBUZO Ndzinisa left the court shocked with his statement that he did not know his child was already attending school.

Ndzinisa said he was still talking to the mother of the child about getting a school for the child but was unaware of the latest developments on this.

He was not prepared to pay school fees

presently as it was not on his budget. He told the court they had only discussed child maintenance. Bongiwe Nyandeni asked for E1 500 from Ndzinisa while telling the court that a portion of the money would be used to pay school fees, food and E900 for transport for the child.

Ndzinisa offered to contribute E500 per month. "I have five children and one of them is in South Africa.

I will not be able to fork out the E1 500. I also do not have certificates for the other children," he said. The matter was also postponed to next Wednesday.



"WE have been subjected to so much ill-treatment that we now dislike anything," said frustrated residents of Qomintaba.

"The way we are treated, it makes us see our government as a monster, this has kept us away from the Umphakatsi. The residents have made it clear that under Chief Gasa WaNgwane, they feel neglected, something they never experienced during the reign of the late Prince Tsekwane.

The residents also said they miss former acting chief Mzweleni as he never troubled them when he was still in charge while Tsekwane's successor was still being groomed. "It was far better than what is happening right now. Mzweleni never gave us problems. Someone has however messed up the good foundation he laid and we are now suffering," said the resident.

The residents said Prince Tsekwane had his own way of making the people more comfortable and never made himself an enemy of the peo-

months. One wonders as to where some of those who are not employed are expected to get that kind of

Mind you, we are contributing towards the welfare of a chief who is employed, we know him to be an employee at His Majesty's Correctional Services.

He is receiving a monthly salary and some of us who are not employed are expected to contribute to this fund. We are being taxed and someone has to stop this," said the resident.

Responding to the claims, Senior Indvuna of Qomintaba Elias Fanalakhe Ndzinisa said he was not aware of any of the claims made by the residents.

He said it was likely that the people making such claims were

being used by a third force. "There is a possibility that some forces are all out to taint the image of Oomintaba.

They are spreading misleading information, yet we are always available to clarify anything one may need clarification on. Spreading lies about the leadership helps no one. Anyone who is not sure about anything, must know that our

doors are always open," said Ndzinisa.

He added that the leadership of Qomintaba has the interest of its people heart, especially the needy and orphaned. He said there were orphaned people who were looking up to the chief for their survival.

"Just not long ago, the chief brought goodies for orphaned and vulnerable children, and he is someone keen to improve the lives of all his people. Orphaned children are his burden and he sometimes goes around searching for those who can assist them in the area," said Ndzinisa.

Ndzinisa said it was also not true that there was a special fund meant to cater for the chief's needs. He said at times it happens that contributions were needed for a certain project, but that should not be interpreted to be designed to benefit the chief. "I don't think there is anything like 'Inhlalakahle Yemntfwanenkhos'

People should have their facts right," said Ndzinisa.

# It is your RIGHT to report and OUR duty to assist you!

A lot of us have had altercations with our banks once or twice in our lives. Some of these are minor, some serious. The question is, how have you dealt with disputes you have come across while dealing with your bank? Have you let it 'slide' because you were too angry to take it up or you did not even know how to address the issue because someone somewhere did not give you the attention you needed, so you simply switched banks?

Well, the truth is, many complaints are caused by misunderstandings that a particular bank can quickly put right -- once you explain the problem, but if you do not have the energy to lay a complaint, that error will probably recur if it is not addressed.

The fact of the matter remains though, that it is frustrating when things go wrong in life in

is frustrating when things go wrong in life in general – whether its deliverables not made in time, a debit order gone wrong or even the repairman not turning up!

On this issue, we will explain how you can lay complaints with the Central Bank of Swaziland Ombudsman office when you have been unable to resolve disputes with your bank.

# What is the office of the Ombudsman?

The Central Bank has an office within its structures appointed to investigate individuals' complaints against maladministration of the bank-

ing sector. This is called the office of the Ombudsman. The office is provided for in Section 42 of the Central Bank Order, 1974 which states that the Central Bank 'shall establish within itself an office of an Ombudsman for financial institutions and prescribe the rules that will govern controversy between financial institutions and their customers and financial institutions and the bank'.

# What does this mean to consumers?

Simply put, this means that the office of the Ombudsman acts as a middle person between banks and their customers in case they have disputes they are failing to resolve. It is your right to use this office, and the responsibility of the Central Bank to assist you if you have been unsuccessful with solving disagreements with your bank.

It is important though that consumers understand that the bank you think is responsible for a problem should have a chance to look into your complaint first – before the Ombudsman steps in, the bank's internal structures having been fully explored. Below are steps you need to follow to assist you in laying your complaint:

# STEP1: Try to sort your complaint with your bank first.

Talk to the person you normally deal with as soon as possible. This could be the floor supervisor, branch manager or the customer care

department.

Explain what the problem is and explain to them what you want from them, this can be an explanation, apology or specific action. Tell them how you want the problem fixed. It is easier to solve problems this way.

If you are not happy with the response, make a formal complaint! Ask for the name of the person you can contact to make a formal complaint.

STEP2: Complain formally to your bank

All licensed banks in the country are regulated by the Central Bank of Swaziland and must have a customer complaints handling system in place.

If the person you are dealing with is not sure how to handle your complaint or where to direct you, ask to deal with a manager or supervisor.

You can make a complaint in person or by telephone, but a written complaint is usually most effective because you can keep copies of your correspondence with the bank.

# Step 3: Contact the Central Bank of Swaziland Ombudsman

If the problem still remains unresolved, you can then contact the Ombudsman office at the

Central Bank. The Ombudsman will ask you to explain your side of the story as well as provide a written statement on your complaint, clearly stating what the problem is and your expected outcome. The Ombudsman will also ask for any supporting information you may have, including copies of all correspondences with your bank pertaining your complaint and accounts statements.

After the Ombudsman has received the details of the dispute, the Ombudsman will

respond to same to enable him to review the dispute holistically to

# ADSL PACKAGES, LOADING AIRTIME AND FAULT REPORT

### HOW TO REPORT A LANDLINE OR **INTERNET FAULT:**

Due to technical reasons, telephone copper wire theft and sometimes natural causes, landlines and ADSL Broadband internet wires get disturbed or damaged to a point where they cause temporal disturbances to service delivery.

SPTC works around the clock to fix these disturbances and restore the service to the client. In an event you have a faulty line, follow these steps to ensure your line is fixed accordingly.

### **LANDLINE FAULTS:**

If your landline has a fault you can call 800 2000 from another landline to report the fault. If you are using a mobile phone then you can dial 971/910 to report the fault.

### INTERNET FAULTS:

If your ADSL Broadband Internet has a fault, you can call 800 6001 from a landline to report the fault. If you are using a mobile phone, then you can dial 971/910 to report

Upon reporting your fault, a reference number will be provided. A reference number

provides us with all the information needed when doing a follow up i.e. when the fault was recorded and the progress thus far. Customers usually want specific timelines on when their line will be fixed and this usually depends on the type/nature of the fault. A business line takes 24 working hours or less to be fixed.

A residential line takes 72 working hours or

All faults are reported at the Contact Centre where 24-hour assistance is guaranteed by our dedicated staff. A contact centre is a central point of contact for customers in any enterprise or organisation.

It can also be defined as an integrated and usually automated communications system that coordinates all telephone and electronic contacts between an organisation and the public.

### The Swaziland Posts and

Telecommunications Corporation also has a contact centre, operating 24 hours. This is the entry point for a majority of our customers when searching for information, whistle blow services and fault reporting. The SPTC contact centre is divided into two sections:

### **OUTBOUND:**

This is where SPTC contact centre agents call customers for; customer satisfaction survey, giving feedback on follow ups, telesales, win back and notifications.

### INBOUND:

This section deals with all customers that call the SPTC toll free numbers (800 2000/ 800 6001/971/910 and 800 2100) for enquires and fault reporting. Customers call contact centre for various reasons i.e. faults reporting; number enquiries, unlimited products activation, follow ups, want information on products and services and general SPTC information

### CONTACT CENTRE AND THE TELECENTRE

The main difference between the Contact Centre and the Telecentre is that the contact centre deals with the customer over soft medium i.e. phone, live chat onwww.sptc.co.sz, and fax, while the Telecentre deals with mainly walk in customers who have come to make account payments and other enquiries.

To activate your ADSL Prepaid Account, or if you wish to make calls on your prepaid landline account, you will need these vouch-

### **RECHARGE VOUCHERS**

Customers are urged to buy recharge vouchers amounting to the ADSL package they have chosen. Loading a lesser amount will not activate the package you applied for initially.

The recharge voucher can also be used to make calls on the landline. Simply 116 and follow the voice prompt.

To make calls on any landline (postpaid or prepaid account) or a public phone, customers can simply purchase the cards above:

Of course officials must be held ac able, whether in their capacity as polit- us. We are a week away from the annu-

ical heads responsible for the administrative department overseeing health at the provincial level, or in their capacity as professional civil servant with a specific mandate to deliver the services of that department.



# COME THINK

ONE of the outstanding features of an undemocratic system of governance is the violation of the right of the public to information, especially information that has been generated through the use of their taxes.

Cabinet ministers often hold it as a birth right that they can unilaterally decide to withhold information from the public, even if such does not raise issues of security but its withdrawal is solely to protect government inefficiencies or protect friends and acquaintances.

Were it not so we would have been given the reasons and allowed to question same why such vital information on the operations of government departments can be kept secret in the first place.

All public investigations instituted in the name of public integrity are in the public interest since they are instituted to satisfy questions on whether there had been no such malpractice as the abuse of office by those entrusted with the responsibility.

If then such investigations that are, in all the cases, instituted at extremely high and exaggerated costs remain secret, then the whole exercise is futile and smacks of bad intentions aimed at defeating the interests and expectations of the public.

Bennett submitted to the commission of inquiry back then that was appointed by then Minister of Housing and Urban Development Stella Lukhele.

Bennett still has some beef with a 2002 matter involving CEO Gideon Mhlongo, who is returning for the second time around at the helm of the municipality against a background of the Bennett beef, that Mhlongo bought a house but continued to draw housing allowance, much against the rules of corporate governance if not an act of outright corruption which the enquiry sought to uproot. In 2003, then Housing Minister Albert Shabangu ordered the recommendation of the commission of enquiry that made this discovery be implemented but this order continues to gather dust even before the very eyes of the dreadful ACC.

Here is another beef: "following the principle of unjust enrichment, Council should recalculate car loans for the CEO and other officers, with a view to make corrective measures. The interest should not start with current loans, but must be calcu-

lated from the date the anomaly started as per recommendation 12.3. Three weeks is allocated for this." But it would be folly or unfair to single out Mhlongo and his par-

I still have in mind the case of the E100 000 stashes of cash that were taken by thugs from the hands of the industrial town's CEO Gciniwe Fakudze, Nothing happened to Gciniwe, save to hear accolades from her principal, Clifford Mamba that the act was a job well done. Mamba had single handedly investigated this and found it to be in order: having investigated the matter, the ministry discovered there was a justifiable reason that led to the town board official carrying so much cash with her.

This is the air Mamba told the Public Accounts Committee in 2012. Fakudze claimed to have been robbed the E100 000 loot which belonged to the Matsapha Town Board after crossing the border to South Africa where she had gone to do some shopping for office furniture or equipment.

Mamba insisted then that Fakudze did not take a unilateral decision to shove the stashes into her briefcase and cross the border but it was an agreement reached together with the board.

### Scheme

We all know what happened in Manzini where the Council lost E11.5 million to a ponzi scheme in South Africa that later collapsed and hopes are still being nursed that liquidators would some day recover what little of the moneys that included retirement funds belonging to managers. An enquiry was instituted but despite that a collective decision was taken, like in the case of Matsapha's E100 000, the friends of the minister were not disbanded while those not in her favour were given the marching orders but no further action was taken, justice had been delivered by Minister Lindiwe Dlamini.

The money was for capital projects such as roads upgrading. Then mayor, Owen Nxumalo, although got a bit of the suave whipping during the sacking, was to be later rewarded with a Cabinet post for an excellent job, that of investing taxpayers' money into a pyramid scheme that later collapsed.

Now on Monday we gather the Ezulwini report has been handed over to the Housing Minister Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza but the million Emalangeni question is what can we expect from this report, will it ever be made public or it will become a private document for the minister? We can only pray, once more, Parliament will act on this one and demand it be made public unless Parliament is convinced it is in the public interest to keep the public document a private affair.

EATING a diet rich in vegetable oil could put you at risk for dementia, experts claim.

Emerging research shows the oil is more likely than others, to cause plaque build up in the brain, a known precursor to serious neurodegenerative diseases.

In the mid-20th century, Americans were increasingly concerned about the growing rate of heart disease and were told to ditch saturated fats - such as butter and cream - in favor of vegetable oil

But Dr Catherine Shanahan, a nutritionist and family physician, says this was a serious mistake.

Shanahan explains that in the 1950s, consumers were told to stop eating saturated fats and turn to products like vegetable oil, which soon became a pantry staple. But there was another factor to its popularity.

### **Establishments**

She told Daily Mail Online: 'Restaurants and other establishments turned to vegetable oil because of the cost and availability. Olive oil is 10 to 50 times more expensive than vegetable oil

'Also, it's very easy to use in cooking because there's not a high smoke point and it doesn't have a flavor like olive oil. So it has a one-size-fits-all factor.' Vegetable oils comes in a variety of forms - canola, palm, corn, soy, sunflower, safflower, cottonseed,

rice bran and grapeseed.

But according to Shanahan, too much of these types of oils in our diets can take a toll on our bodies.

She says vegetable oils can make you feel foggy and fatigued, cause migraines and even trigger diseases such as Alzheimer's or dementia later down the line. 'Vegetable oil causes oxidative stress, which damages brain membranes and results in plaque

building up on the brain,' she said.

'We've seen in research with Alzheimer's patients, that doctors will biopsy part of the brain and see that plaque has built up.

But Shanahan says that even if you've grown up eating a diet rich in vegetable oil, you can reverse the negative effects by just cutting it out.

# Could palm oil be cancerous?

ONE of the main ingredients in Nutella, the popular hazelnut chocolate spread, was the subject of a recent warning.

A report by the European Food Safety Authority (EFSA) declared palm oil to be more carcinogenic than any other oil, following similar claims from the World Health Organisation.

Nutella relies on palm oil for its smooth texture and considerably long shelf life

Ferrero, the company that makes Nutella, has launched a television campaign, insisting it uses palm oil in a way that is not dangerous - because it is refined at a lower heat, and therefore contains fewer contaminants.

But the EFSA report say it is dangerous when refined at temperatures above 200 degrees Celsius.

High temperatures are used to remove

palm oil's natural red color and neutralise its smell. This process, however, causes contaminants called glycidyl fatty acid esters (GE) to form.

When digested, GE has a tendency to break down and release glycidol, a compound strongly believed to cause tumors. She said: 'I would encourage people to take a seven day challenge and they'll realise it's in everything and that's the problem.

'If you get rid of it, your taste buds will wake up a little bit, you'll taste food the way it's supposed to taste and you'll see improvement. You'll have more energy.'

A report released in May by the European Food Safety Authority found components in palm oil - the most heavily utilised vegetable oil and found in products such as Nutella - to be 'geotoxic and carcinogenic'.

In a statement to the Daily Mail Online, a representative for Ferrero, the company that makes Nutella, said the palm oil used in the hazelnut chocolate spread is refined at a lower heat, and therefore contains fewer contaminants. Dr Shanahan said that this does help lower the risks, but not

'It's like saying, "Mom, I'm going to start smoking but I'll be smoking just three cigarettes a day instead of a whole pack." You're not going to be very happy about it,' she said.

'Companies want these oils because they have anti-microbial benefits that extend their shelf life and prevent them from going bad - but that's because they're toxic.'

Much more research has since come out linking vegetable oils to heart disease and antioxidant depletion.

The oil is promoted as healthy because it contains monounsaturated fats and Omega-3 fatty acids. But it also contains high levels of polyunsaturated

These fats oxidise easily, depleting the body of antioxidants and causing inflammation and mutation in cells.

Vegetable oil also contains trans fats, which are highly toxic and associated with an increased risk of various diseases, like heart disease, cancer, diabetes and obesity.

In the last few years, research has begun to tout the benefits of hearthealthy fats such as butter and avocados.

Shanahan says that consumers would do well to replace vegetable oils with olive, coconut, avocado or peanut oils.

She said: 'I would say when you're doing your own cooking choose oils that have a flavor, like coconut or peanut, and then make sure that it's unrefined.' Daily Mail

# Surprising foods you should always eat before bed if you want a good sleep


INSOMNIA affects roughly one in three people, while most adults struggle to get a full eight hours every night.

# CBS LAUNCHES E150M BOND

ON behalf of government, the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) yesterday announced the launch of a five-year government bond.


According to a statement issued by the CBS, the coupon rate, understood to be the interest rate for this bond, would be fixed at 10.5 per cent and the auction date shall be February 23, for the sum of E150 million.

"The bond will be issued by competitive multiple bid auction and is open to the public, including individuals, corporate and institutional investors," reads the statement in part.

The bank said all investors were expected to apply through primary dealers who are the four local commercial banks.

It also said investors should ensure applications were submitted timely in order that all bids were captured on the Central Securities Depository (CSD) system before 10am on the auction date.

"The purpose of the issuance is



to develop the secondary market, establish a fair market price which will compensate both the borrower and investors for interest rate risks and to facilitate financial intermediation, whilst also meeting gov-

ernment budgetary requirements," the CBS said.

Secondary market trading in multiples of E10 000 will commence on March 8. This refers to the buying and selling of bonds by own-

ers and potential buyers of the bonds.

A financial analyst from a leading financial services firm said subject to the individual investors risk appetite, investment horizon time period and fixed income, government debt instruments present an opportunity for investors to obtain returns higher than inflation.

"It is widely accepted that in the investment industry, government bonds can be considered the closest investment that is said to be risk free as it is unlikely for a government to default on its financial market obligation," he said.

The analyst made an example of a parent that has a seven-year-old child that buys a fixed term 10-year government bond at 10.75 per cent.

"The parent would get annual interest payments of the money they invested for 10 years and at the end of that period they would receive their initial investment. At this time, the child is likely around 17 and is looking to get into tertiary education this investment would go a long way in paying for their tuition," he said.

# SMEs NEED TO FOCUS ON MANUFACTURING'

SMALL and medium enterprises (SMEs) can contribute much to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) if they can focus on manufacturing other than retail.

Southern African Research Foundation for Economic Development (SARFED) Regional Coordinator George Choongwa, said it had been observed that about 70 per cent SMEs were engaged in some form of retail businesses rather than manufacturing.

"There is a need for these businesses to consider some of the benefits associated with engagement in small scale manufacturing process such as job creation, skills improvement, and

ready market," he said.

He said the manufacturing processes, despite of its level and profile, had a high possibility of engaging human labour, "by so doing, this would eventually bring about a considerable wide spread of job creation in the country, especially among the people who might have had little chances of getting formal

jobs."

As a result, he said this could eventually reduce levels of poverty per head count, because people would have basic means of survival.

"In as much as it is impossible for government to provide jobs for everyone in the country, but it is possible for it to encourage self-employment mechanism through the manufacturing approach," he said.

He said the second consideration with regards to focusing on micro manufacturing approach by small businesses, was the gaining of relevant skills and improvements in the levels of efficiency. Choongwa said this was because manufactur-

ing demands a continuous learning approach which could help small busi-

ness owners to gain or improve on their respective levels of skills and efficiency. "It is important to know that once the individuals in the society, either, at domestic or commercial levels learnt or become



skillfully productive, then it would be much easier for them to learn and transmit the skills to others which would eventually bring about improved and high efficient levels of human capital in the country," said the regional coordinator.

Vital role

Adding, he said this sector also played a vital role in the development of the SMEs in the sense that manufacturing has to do with high levels of creativity and innovation, which also describes the prominence of SMEs in the entire economy.

Meanwhile, he said the other advantage that comes into play with regards to promoting micro entrepreneurship manufacturing businesses was the market readiness, both at regional and internal levels.

The country is a member of both

the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) regions, amongst other trade blocs. Recently, the country signed and ratified the European Union (EU)-SADC Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) which allows the country duty free and quota free access for all their products, except arms and ammunition, into the EU market.

Choongwa said it was for this reason that manufacturers should take advantage of the export markets which would also attract the foreign direct investments (FDI).

"The country has gained much reputation in the region on its policies of peace and a good relation with other countries which makes it highly possible to take advantage of the competitive edge," he concluded.

# **Blue Financial Services** Swaziland faces liquidation


**BLUE Financial Services Group has** hit the final nail in the coffin of the local branch by firmly stating the subsidiary will be closed and liqui-

According to a trading statement released by the Group, it said a decision had been taken to proceed with the liquidation and closure of the following investments of the company due to their lack of viability; Blue Ltd Kenya, Blue Financial Services Lesotho, Blue Financial Services Ltd Mauritius, Blue Financial Services Swaziland (Pty) Ltd, Blue Employee Benefits Ltd Uganda and Mobile U (Pty) Ltd.

"As advised in terms of previous Stock Exchange News Service (SENS) announcements and as a direct consequence of the failed recapitalisation, Mayibuye has also called up the debts that the Blue Group has to it," reads the statement in part.

According to an article published in this newspaper dated May 22, 2014, Blue Financial Services was officially launched in the country in July 2008 and also opened its doors to customers at its office in Mbabane.

It initially invested eight million to establish the local branch and planned to invest a further E60 million in the



next year to expand its operations in the country. At the height of the micro finance institutions operations it had four branches in the country, mainly Mbabane, Manzini, Pigg's Peak and Nhlangano.

The company recorded losses, which culminated in the group closing all its branches in Swaziland, except for the Mbabane branch.

A trading statement released by the group last year, said Blue Financial Services would be audited to establish

its financial viability. The audits up to December 2014 for Namibia, Malawi, Swaziland and Uganda were anticipated to be completed by end of March 2016.

When the local branch offices of the company were visited yesterday, they were found locked. According to a next door officer, the offices have been closed for months now.

"Even before the closure, as I understand it, the company was no longer lending money to consumers," he said.

# Still a gap in milk, by-products supply

THERE is still a mammoth gap in the supply of milk and milk equivalents in the country.

According to the Swaziland Dairy Board (SDB) statistics for 2016, the country imported a total of over 20 million kilograms per litre of milk and milk equivalents in the previous year.

These included: raw milk, raw milk, baby formula, condensed milk, ice cream and yoghurt.

In its strategic plan 2015-2018, SBD said the local dairy industry has seen positive growth from the previous years in milk production. However the increase in milk demand has put much pressure on the local production.

Recently, Parmalat Swaziland Country Director Martin Herbst said they have had a significant increase in local milk production this year, about 96.9 per cent, which has reduced the requirement for raw milk imports.

However, due to the increasing domestic consumption demand, which now edges at 69 million litres in liquid milk equivalents, SDB said this indicates there were still enormous investments opportunities in the industry.

Only about five dairy products are processed in the industry.

These products include dairy juices, fresh milk, cream, emasi and yoghurt. The majority of the consumed products are imported.

Therefore, SDB said through the strategy, it seeks to improve the production and marketing of dairy products through continued capacity building, mentorship and coaching programmes, improved animal health services, local breeding programme for dairy animals, continues fodder flow, execution of Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with partner financial institutions, value addition, group formation, resuscitation and management of royal farms and promotion of dairy consumption.

The board also said it would focus on governance and legislative reforms to guide the development and improvement of the dairy industry.

"An implementation plan has been prepared for the strategic plan that clear articulates all the action steps to be taken in order to achieve the formulated strategic objec-

"The board has developed a strategic monitoring and evaluation plan to ensure that implementation of the progress is monitored and corrective measures are taken where remedial attention is required," said SDB.

# Swaziland to receive IP system source code

SWAZILAND has been named amongst beneficiary countries to receive an online automated Intellectual Property (IP) registration system source code from Microsoft 4Africa.

A source code is specially designed to facilitate the work of computer programmers. In simpler terms, it works like an instruction or plan for system programmers.

Microsoft is handing over the source code with the intention to help IP authorities across Africa drive a culture of IP

According to Africa Telecom&IT, the ready to scale and proven model would be shared with authorities in 18 countries across Africa, in collaboration with the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), to support their commitments towards IP pro-

Other beneficiary countries within COMESA include Zimbabwe, Zambia. Malawi, Mauritius and Madagascar.

Africa Telecom&IT said the system was first developed and tested by Microsoft 4Afrika, through their IP Hub initiative, and the Kenya Copyright Board (KECOBO) in June last year.

"The system that KECOBO was privileged to pilot worked well during the trial. KECOBO saw over a 100 per cent jump in registrations in the June - October period when the system was running," said KECOBO Chief Executive Officer Edward Kipsigei.

"As a result of the test, KECOBO will

shortly commission a fully online registration system based on the prototype. My office highly recommends the adoption of the system by those states that will benefit from the source code. At KECOBO, we remain ready to share our experiences with other IP offices," he added.

System

The online registration system replaces the traditional manual process of submitting paper-based forms, making the registration of IP fast, accessible and more efficient. COMESA Secretary General Sindiso Ngwenya said this was good news to the region given that all of its member states were covered.

"Specifically, it will bolster our science, technology and innovation programme to further the COMESA regional integration agenda," he said.

"Every country in Africa is committed to accelerating its economic growth and becoming globally competitive. Because we live in the information age,

a critical aspect of achieving this is the monetisation of IP," said Corporate Affairs Director of Microsoft 4Afrika, Louis Otieno.

"We created the online registration system as a way to jump-start this process and help close the structural gap. To now ensure its sustainability, we look forward to seeing local IP authorities own the process and the technology, which will only require minor customisations on our end," Otieno further stated. IP protection, including patents, trademarks and copyrights have been said to be essential for small businesses to get ahead of their competitors, generate investment and ultimately bring their ideas to market.

Analysts argued that innovations in Africa do not come to fruition due to of lack of knowledge about, and red tape around, registering IP.

According to the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO), resident applications for patents in various African countries are still low. In 2014, there were 752 patent applications in Egypt, 132 in Kenya, 14 in Zambia and only five in Rwanda, compared to over 280 000 in the U.S. and 19 000 in the United Kingdom. At the same time, the registration of copyright in many African states has not taken off and this data is not taken into account in economic sur-

"When the registration process becomes more accessible, fast and reliable, it also becomes more attractive. With the online system, we hope to see the number of copyright and other IP applications rise in the coming years," added Louis.

# **UNCERTAINTY LINGERS OVER PETROL PRICE INCREASE**

THE rise in international crude oil prices is expected to result in higher petrol prices in the country.

In his most recent Monetary Policy Consultative Committee (MPCC) statement, Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) Governor Majozi Sithole, said the situation was likely to exert upward pressure on inflation.

"Other threats to the inflation outlook include a possible rise in some government controlled prices, such as prices of bread, electricity, water as well as transport," he

In a recent statement, the World Bank forcasted crude oil prices to reach \$55 per barrel from \$53 per barrel as members of the Organisation of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) prepare to limit production after a long period of unrestrained out-

"Energy prices, which include oil, natural gas and coal, are projected to jump almost 25 per cent overall this year, a larger increase than anticipated in July last year,"

"We expect a solid rise in energy prices, led by oil, next year," said John Baffes, Senior Economist and lead author of the Commodity Markets Outlook.

"However, there is considerable

uncertainty around the outlook as we await the details and the implementation of the OPEC agreement, which, if carried through, will undoubtedly impact oil mar-

The CBS said it expects food inflation to remain high for the first half of 2017 which would also keep inflation relatively high.

Previously, economist Thembinkosi Dube said an increase in petrol prices would have negative impacts on the economy of Swaziland, especially now as the economy was still struggling.

"Fuel is the engine of any economy, fluctuations in its price is felt by all sectors of the economy," he

He said petrol price shocks tend to have significant effects on the macroeconomic variables of net oil-importing countries like Swaziland, including economic growth, employment, balance of payments and government accounts.

Adding, Dube said the effects of oil price increases on economic growth reflected reductions in output in most economic activities.

"Manufacturing and transportation are especially affected by the increase in costs, and indirectly as a result of the reduction in and unreliability of energy supply,'

Dube, echoing the CBS assertion, said even inflation would be affected by an increase in petrol


# ARMYWORM ATTACK ON SA FARMS WILL BE 'DISASTROUS'

JOHANNESBURG – South African maize farms are suffering "extensive" damage from what appears to be an alien caterpillar that destroyed fields in other countries in the region, according to the government.

While the government is yet to verify the pest as the fall armyworm that's native to the Americas and arrived in Africa last year, the caterpillar may pose a serious threat to production of the staple food, the department of agriculture, forestry and fisheries said in an e-mailed statement on Wednesday.

The pest has been reported in northem Limpopo and North West provinces, the department said. North West and the central Free State province account for the bulk of South Africa's maize output.

"If this pest is indeed the fall armyworm, it could be disastrous, particularly to maize production," the depart-



ment said.

Zambia, Malawi and Zimbabwe already suffered extensive damage to tens of thousands of hectares of mainly corn fields. The arrival of the alien species threatens to hurt corn output as Southern Africa is recovering from its worst drought in over 35 years, even as rainfall improves.

South Africa could increase its maize crop to at least 11.9 million metric tonnes this year from 7.5 million tonnes, the agricultural business chamber said last month. Maize for delivery in March, the most active contract, rose by 3.6%, the most since October, to R2 869 per tonne on Wednesday.

# Budget 2017 is going to be painful

JOHANNESBURG - Burden falls on individual's shoulders.

The tax announcements in this year's budget is going to test the pain tolerance levels of all taxpayers.

Direct and indirect tax increases are a must, and by the looks of things Joe Average is going to fork out the largest chunk of the additional R28 billion needed to balance government's books.

As though things are not bad enough going forward, it appears that 2016 is going to end on a worse note than earlier anticipated. Tax experts now anticipate the revised shortfall of R23 billion to increase with another R7 billion at most

Kyle Mandy, tax partner at PwC, says the "volatility" of the monthly tax collection data makes any projections on where the final collection numbers will end very difficult.

He says starting from a lower than anticipated base, with a huge revenue target in a slow-growth economic environment things are going to be tough on taxpayers.

He expects an increase across all personal income tax brackets, except perhaps the lowest bracket (18%), of one percentage point. This will increase the top marginal tax rate for individuals to 42%, filling the revenue hole with at least R15 billion.

Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan will be delivering the budget to parliament on February 22.

Nazrien Kader, head of Deloitte tax services in Africa, says lifting the top marginal rate to 45% could yield R3.5 billion. It is also "conceivable" that a special levy or surcharge may be applied to individuals with earnings above a set threshold.

"This is also likely to apply to companies based on turnover as a means to collect some tax from companies when profits are non-existent," says Kader.

Andrew Wellsted, tax head at Norton Rose Fulbright, expresses skepticism about the success of bridging the revenue gap by upping individual and even company tax rates.

He says with the economy dragging

its heels, taxpayers struggling to make ends meet and companies not coining it, it is a good time to consider an increase in the Value Added Tax rate. An increase of 1% or even 1.5% to 15.5% may have a significant impact on tax collections.

Kader notes that the South African VAT rate is much lower than the 20% in most other jurisdictions. The Davis Tax Committee reported that an increase to 15% will bring South Africa in line with the global average of 15.65% and the African average of 15.25%.

This can yield revenue of between R15 billion and R20 billion. Mandy says an increase is possible, provided there is relief to the poor in the form of an increase in the social grant allowance, or a widening of the zero rated goods.

Both these relief measures are possible and practical to implement in a short time frame. However, given the possible political fallout of a VAT increase, a significant increase in the fuel levy might be another option. A hefty 50c/l increase may yield around R10 billion, says Mandy. *News24* 

# South Africa open to digital currency

JOHANNESBURG - Regulators are concerned with striking a balance between managing benefits and risks.

The South African Reserve Bank (SARB) is open to issuing a national digital currency, which would likely be based on Blockchain or Distributed Ledger Technology (DLT).

"If we go the route of issuing a digital currency, the objective would be to take advantage of emerging technologies so that we reap the benefits," said Tim Masela, head of the National Payments System at the SARB.

The central bank is currently observing moves by other countries to issue fiat currencies, which offer similar benefits and conveniences to cryptocurrencies, in a digital format. It will also carry out its own experiments and evaluations to determine whether such offerings would be appropriate for South Africa.

To date, Tunisia is said to be the only nation to have successfully issued a digital currency. It is reportedly migrating its self-created eDinar onto a blockchain. The eCFA, a digital version of the West African franc, is to be rolled out in Senegal later this year, with the Banque Régionale De Marchés planning to extend distribution across the West African Economic and Monetary Union. Meanwhile, the Swedish central bank is considering issuing an eKrona, and the United Kingdom's Treasury

has published the outcome of its call for information on digital currencies.

According to Masela, the potential benefits that could be derived from a South African national digital currency include the convenience of use, greater inclusion due to its reach, real-time settlements and a reduced cost of use.

"We foresee that these benefits could be realised, which would be good for the transacting public. But of course, the risks have to be borne in mind as well and that's what we want to balance," he said.

He labelled cyber-attacks and the unregulated nature of the emerging business models, spurred by technology, as an area where potential risks may be introduced

"The proponents of the technology say 'you don't need to regulate it; it will self-regulate'.

We don't have an idea of how that will happen, we still need to reflect on this and need a good case [to show] that it can self-regulate. Otherwise, we believe that if it is not regulated and things go wrong, it could have a spillover effect into the financial systems," he said.

The SARB has yet to establish a firm position on the use of a fiat currency in digital form and is open to further exploring the issue, Masela stressed.

However, its stance on cryptocurrencies is clear.

# MTN ups stake in African cell tower operator

JOHANNESBURG - Mobile network MTN [JSE:MTN] has increased its stake in cellphone tower company IHS Group from 15% to approximately 29%, the company said.

To facilitate the transaction, MTN said it will exchange its 51% interest in Nigeria Tower InterCo, the parent company of Nigerian telecom tower operator INT Towers Limited, for the additional shareholding in IHS Holding.

INT Towers, which was founded in 2014 by IHS Group and MTN, previously acquired 8 850 existing towers from MTN Nigeria.

MTN said the transaction is expected to close once the new shares in IHS Group have been issued during Q1 2017.

In an update to shareholders, MTN said the transaction is aimed at simplifying its tower ownership structure and diversifying its infrastructure exposure across Africa.

IHS Group - founded in 2001 - describes itself as the largest independent tower operator in Africa, Europe and Middle East and the tenth largest independent tower company in the world, with over 23 300 towers.

In recent years, mobile net-

works across Africa have pushed to reduce their ownership of towers and increasingly lease them instead, from companies such as IHS, in a bid to reduce capital expenditure.

"The transaction represents a significant step in MTN's long-standing partnership with IHS," said MTN's executive chairman Phuthuma Nhleko.

"It simplifies our ownership structure and diversifies our tower investments across the IHS Group. IHS Group is extremely well positioned for future growth and build-out from 3G upgrades and the move to LTE across its key markets," said Nhleko.

# Vodacom data prices 'fall' by over 15%

JOHANNESBURG - Mobile network Vodacom says its data prices have fallen by 15.4% over the last year, according to the company's latest trading update for the quarter ended December 31 2016.

"As part of our effort to continuously reduce the cost to communicate in South Africa through our bundle pricing strategy, voice and data prices fell by 17.6% and 15.4% respectively as significantly more prepaid and contract customers benefitted from using bundles." said Vodacom.

"Over the past four years we have reduced the price of data by more than 60%. Another significant win in helping bridge the digital divide was the introduction of a 4G device below the key R1 000 price-point to add to the success of the

Smart Kicka 2, a low-priced yet high quality 3G smartphone," said Vodacom.

Vodacom's mention of falling data prices comes after the #DataMustFall trend went viral on social media late last year.

The hashtag was driven by radio personality Thabo "Tbo Touch" Molefe who said that South Africa's data prices are "daylight robbery" and that data must fall.

# LE OVERTAKES SAMSUNG N SMARTPHONE WARS

reported a rebound in iPhone sales to lift the tech giant to record revenue in the past quarter in quarterly results that eased concerns of slowing growth.

The results showed strong demand for Apple's iPhone 7 models launched last year, with demand outpacing supply.

Revenue climbed to an all-time record \$78.4bn compared to \$75.9bn in the same period a year earlier, the company said in its earnings update for the quarter ending in December.

Compared with the same quarter a year earlier, profit dipped 2.6% to \$17.9bn.

Apple shares were up nearly three per cent to \$124.80 in after-market trades that followed release of the earnings results.

Apple said it sold 78.3 million iPhones - the most ever in a quarter - up five per cent from the same prime holiday shopping period the prior year.

The sales made Apple the world's top smartphone vender in the final three months of last year, overtaking Samsung, according to industry tracker Strategy Analytics.

The growth promised to assuage concerns by investors that iPhone sales, which account for the bulk of Apple's revenue, were softening due to three quarters of sequential decline.

"We're thrilled to report that our holiday quarter results generated Apple's highest quarterly revenue ever, and broke multiple records along the way," said Apple Chief Executive Tim Cook.

The California-based company said it "set all-time revenue records for iPhone, services, Mac and Apple Watch."

The amount of money taken in from online services and digital content grew strongly, led by unprecedented buying



at Apple's online App Store, according to Cook.

"I have not yet done the numbers, but I think Apple had the best quarter in the history of humanity," Asymco analyst Horace Dediu said in a comment fired off on Twitter.

Apple, however, saw revenue in its important China market drop 12% to \$16.2bn, according to the earnings report.

The company's performance in China improved from the previous quarter and but was hampered by a strong US dollar, according to Apple.

Challenges

Cook said he was encouraged, though Apple still faces challenges in mainland China.

Apple also intends to "invest significantly" in India, he told analysts during an earning call.

Neil Saunders, Managing Director of the research firm GlobalData Retail, said Apple's strong report eased concerns it had hit a bump in growth.

"The iPhone 7 will be a much steadier contributor and we would argue that the new model has been a success," Saunders said in a note to clients.

"It is clear that Apple did enough to

stimulate interest and persuade many consumers to upgrade."

But Saunders said Apple "competitors, including Google and Amazon, are still nipping at its heels with new products and ideas - so it needs to speed up, even if it is just to stand still."

Some analysts say Apple remains too dependent on the iPhone and it needs to better diversify revenue, amid a sputtering smartphone market and intense competition.


The success of the iPhone sets the stage for Apple to be at the heart of smartphone lifestyles in which people synch with homes, security systems, cars, health care and more with mobile

It also puts Apple in position to make money from digital content, services, or online commerce.

"Our ecosystem is broadening to more and more of the areas where people spend their time: at the gym, on the go, in the home, and on the job," Cook said.

Apple said services revenue grew 18% from a year ago to \$7.2bn, while "other" products, including the Apple Watch, brought in \$4 billion.

# Mercedes-Benz luxury cars fuel fat profits at Daimler

FRANKFURT - German automaker Daimler says fourthquarter net profit rose 18 per cent as the company's flagship Mercedes-Benz brand reaped fat returns on new SUV mod-

Net profit hit 2.2 billion euros (\$2.4 billion), up from 1.9 billion in the year-ago quarter. Group revenue rose one per cent to 41 billion euros.

Booming profits at Mercedes-Benz outweighed losses at the company's truck business, which

lost sales in Turkey and the Middle East. Operating earnings at the luxury brand rose 53 per cent to 2.56 billion.

For the full year, Daimler made 8.7 billion euros net profit, up slightly from 2015.

The company said its profits from the full year meant it could pay up to \$5 400 in profit-sharing bonuses to 130 000 eligible workers in Germany. They'll get the money in their April paychecks.

# Capitec still South Africa's most popular bank - Nielsen

**CAPE TOWN - Capitec** Bank on Wednesday said new research had shown that it had increased its lead as South Africa's most popular bank.

The bank, which was established in 2001, said consumer research group Nielsen's most recent annual banking survey also showed that Capitec Bank now had more clients than both FNB and Nedbank, making it the third largest retail bank in the country.

our costs low, giving customers the freedom to pay as they transact as well as offering the highest interest of 5.35 per cent on a positive bank balance," said Charl Nel, Capitec's Head of Communications.



# We have failed, SASSA admits

**CAPE TOWN - The South** African Social Security Agency (SASSA) is to apply to the Constitutional Court to extend the grant payments contract of Cash Paymaster Services (CPS) for another year.

The announcement by the agency on Wednesday confirmed concerns raised by political parties and civil society about the agency's ability to take over the payments of social grants, in line with a commitment to the court.

Sassa's current contract with CPS was declared invalid in 2014. Rather than appoint a new contractor, SASSA then submitted a plan to the court to take over the payments to 17 million beneficiaries on 1 April 2017.

"After carefully considering our options, we felt it may cause panic if we try and implement a new system. We acknowledge we have failed," said SASSA official Raphaahle Ramokgopa. She said SASSA's legal team would head to the Constitutional Court next week to request that the ruling declaring the invalidity of the current CPS contract be suspended. SASSA is yet to approach CPS on this proposal.

Ramakgopa was among a delegation from SASSA and the Department of Social Development, briefing Parliament's portfolio committee on Social Development on its progress to institutionalise the payment of social

The commissioner has been in the spotlight following an investigation by the Independent Police Investigative Directorate (IPID) into his lifestyle.


IPID is investigating Phahlane over property which allegedly cost R8m. His car collection has also been added to the scope of the investigation.


Citing sources that attended an ANC meeting of top leaders last week, Business Day newspaper said Zuma had accused the nation-

# EFF to lay criminal charges against Qedani over deaths

JOHANNESBURG - The Economic Freedom Fighters says it will lay criminal charges against former Gauteng Health MEC, Qedani Mahlangu at Johannesburg Central Hospital.

The party called Mahlangu a "killer" for being the driving force to move patients from Life Esidimeni homes to unregistered NGOs. The NGOs were found to have been unsafe, crowded, without sufficient heating and without skilled staff. At least 94 people died from hunger, dehydration and diseases unrelated to mental health.

Mahlangu's decision was described as "reckless" by health ombudsman Professor Malegapuru Makgoba.

Mahlangu's resignation was announced on Wednesday by the Gauteng Premier.

The EFF says it will lay charges against anyone else implicated in the killing of the patients.

The ANC Youth League has also indicated it wishes to lay charges of murder against the former health MEC.

Jack Bloom of the Democratic Alliance said: "It took 141 days for Mahlangu to resign following the first disclosure of deaths in reply to my question in the Gauteng Legislature on 13 September last year."

Bloom continued: "Premier (David) Makhura has failed badly in this matter and needs to keep his promises to ensure that action is taken against all those implicated, including criminal charges."

The DA's health spokesman said Mahlangu's replacement, Dr Gwen Ramokgopa, was a poor MEC when she was in charge.

"I am not impressed with the return of Dr Gwen Ramokgopa as MEC of the Gauteng Health Department," said Bloom. "She was mediocre in this position previously and does not have the drive to fix this deeply dysfunctional department. TIMESLIVE

# WITS PROFESSOR FOUND GUILTY OF SEXUAL HARASSMENT, DISMISSED

JOHANNESBURG – A professor at the University of Witwatersrand accused of sexually harassing colleagues at the institution, was found guilty and dismissed on Wednesday, Vice-Chancellor and Principal Adam Habib said.

Three women laid complaints against the academic with the institution's gender equity office (GEO) last year, which subsequently investigated the case, he said.

"An independent investigation was undertaken and the staff member was found guilty of misconduct on the grounds of sexual harassment in respect of three complainants," Habib said in a statement.



"The independent panel further found the misconduct to be a dismissible offence, and the outcome was presented to me today [Wednesday]. In line with the university's policies and processes, I

have informed the individual concerned that he has been dismissed."

The professor reportedly committed the offences over a period of time. He allegedly pressured the three women for sexual favours in

exchange for his influence and seniority at the institution. Habib said the university's gender office was established five years ago to deal with sexual harassment complaints.

"The university does not tolerate any form of GBH and as a public institution, we are determined to eliminate gender-based harm. Again, I would like to make it very clear that the university will not tolerate any form of sexual harassment. We have revised our policies, instituted several programmes and conscientised the university community to speak out and act against gender-based harm."

WHAT IS EV?


EV is a rare and inherited skin disorder which creates wart-like lesions anywhere on the body.


# PASTOR MAWARIRE ARRESTED ON RETURN TO ZIMBABWE FROM US

HARARE – A Zimbabwean pastor, accused last year of trying to overthrow President Robert Mugabe's government after calling for protests, was arrested at the airport when he flew home from the United States on Wednesday, his lawyer said.

Evan Mawarire was previously arrested and charged last July, but was freed by a magistrate's court which said police had not followed procedure.

Harrison Nkomo, his lawyer, said the pastor had been arrested at Harare's airport and was taken to the capital's central police station.

Police spokeswoman, Charity Charamba confirmed Mawarire's arrest, saying he had an outstanding warrant after failing to appear



in court last year. She did not provide more details.

"The law will always catch up with you even if you go away.

Mawarire had a warrant of arrest against him," Charamba said.

After he was freed by the court in July, police had said they still

wanted to file more charges against Mawarire. He travelled to South Africa and then the United States, where he had been living with his family since July.

His absence drew condemnation from supporters, who accused him of abandoning them when his leadership was needed.

Mawarire rose to fame after posting a video online last year that went viral, venting his anger about deteriorating social and economic conditions in Zimbabwe and urging citizens to hold the government to account.

The preacher's social media movement #ThisFlag rattled Mugabe's administration, leading to accusations by the state against Mawarire of inciting public violence.

# DRC OPPOSITION ICON, TSHISEKEDI DIES

KINSHASA - Democratic Republic of Congo's opposition icon Etienne Tshisekedi, who pushed for democratic reforms for decades in the vast central African nation throughout dictatorship and civil war, has died, his political party has said. He was 84.

His death comes at a politically fragile moment for DRC, where he was heavily involved in the recent deal to get President Joseph Kabila to agree to step down by the end of this year, after months of deadly protests. The parties signed a deal that has yet to be implemented.

The stalemate already had worried observers, and Tshisekedi's death is likely to compound the difficulties.

Tshisekedi had been seeking medical treatment in Belgium, DRC's former coloniser. He has long battled ill health because of complications from diabetes. In 2010, he walked the 25km from the airport to his suburban home in Kinshasa upon his triumphant return from medical treatment abroad.

# Gambian Imam urges reconciliation after dictator's exile

KANIFING - Locked inside a tiny cell, Imam Alhagie Ousman Sawaneh was only allowed out for an hour each day.

For one year, three months and nearly 10 days, he sought the answer to one simple question: "What have I done?"

Like so many others who disappeared in the dead of night in Gambia, Sawaneh had few answers as to why he had been targeted and imprisoned by dictator Yahya Jammeh's regime.

The 65-year-old had been picked up as he led volunteers

clearing grass in the local cemetery in October 2015 and held at a prison in the Central River Region. While he had helped present a petition calling for the release of arrested rice farmers, he never dreamt that would cost him his freedom.

Now he, like so many others in a new Gambia, can only look forward. "For 22 years, there has been suffering, killing," Sawaneh said with pain and conviction in his eyes. "Jammeh has gone. Gambia is here ... Let's work on the country for

Sawaneh was released on

January 24, just days after Jammeh fled into exile in Equatorial Guinea under an arrangement brokered by fellow West African leaders. It was the end to a political crisis sparked by Jammeh's refusal to cede power after losing December's presidential election to opposition candidate Adama Barrow.

In the final days of Jammeh's rule, political prisoners started to be released. An untold number, though, are believed to still be held at the notorious Mile

# Zimbabwe slaps VAT on basic foodstuffs

HARARE - Zimbabwe started levying a 15 per cent value-added tax on basic foodstuffs Wednesday, the government said, dealing a further blow to cash-strapped consumers already battling to survive in an ailing economy.

The tax affects meat and staple foods such as cereals, rice and potatoes. Other goods listed by the finance ministry include margarine, fish and pork. The move comes at a time when Zimbabweans are faced with unemployment of over 90 percent and rising levels of poverty. The country once considered the bread basket of Africa, now imports most of its food, after the agricultural sector was brought to its knees by the



seizures of white-owned commercial farms under President Robert Mugabe's administration. In 2016, the government banned a range of food imports from neighbouring South Africa, in a bid to boost the local market which is battling cash shortages. The VAT announcement was slammed as "anti-people" by the opposition Movement for Democratic Change (MDC), which predicted a sharp increase in food prices. *iNet Bridge* 



BANJUL - The dog that killed the son of Gambian President, Adama Barrow has been put down, an agriculture ministry source said, with mystery over the circumstances sparking witchcraft rumours amid political turmoil in the country. Eight-year-old Habibou, one of Barrow's five children, died after the attack last month, days before his father's contested inauguration at a time when then-president Yahya Jammeh was refusing to step down. Jammeh's refusal to cede power to Barrow, who won a December election, triggered a crisis in the small west African nation, before the longtime leader eventually agreed to hand over the reins to his successor and leave the country. *AFP* 

# Kenya to rejoin S. Sudan UN force

New York - Kenya has agreed to take part in a UN regional force for South Sudan, the UN Secretary General, Antonio Guterres said on Wednesday, three months after Nairobi angrily withdrew its troops from the country. Kenya pulled its peacekeepers from South Sudan and announced it would not contribute to the planned regional force after Guterres' predecessor, Ban Ki-moon, fired the Kenyan commander of the peacekeeping force. The commander was sacked following a report that showed the UN peacekeepers failed to protect civilians during heavy fighting in Juba in July.



### Role play eases pain

LAGOS - Puffing on the cannabis joints dangling from their mouths, a group of teenage boys hurl insults at a stream of pupils as they rush past them on their way to school. But the joints are empty, and the words are hollow. These young Nigerians are using role play to highlight the problem of drug abuse among youths in a camp for the displaced, who are turning to marijuana to numb the pain inflicted by Boko Haram. The destruction of their homes and the killings of their friends and relatives have traumatised countless adults and children across northeast Nigeria, where the militant group has waged a bloody seven-year campaign to create an Islamic state. **REUTERS**

# 'TRUMP TRAVEL BAN NOT ANTI-ISLAM'

ABU DHABI - US President Donald Trump's travel ban on citizens of seven Muslim-majority nations is not anti-Islam, the United Arab Emirates foreign minister said on Wednesday.

Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed al-Nahyan, whose country like neighbouring Saudi Arabia is a close ally of Washington, said it was "wrong to say" that the decision by the new US administration was "directed against a particular religion". "The United States has made... a sovereign decision," he said at a joint press conference with his Russian counterpart, Sergei Lavrov, pointing out it was "provisional" and did not apply to "the large majority" of the world's Muslims. In his defence of the ban which has stirred widespread protests across the globe, Sheikh Abdullah also said that some of

# Senate confirms Tillerson to be Trump's secretary

WASHINGTON - The Republican-controlled Senate on Wednesday confirmed Rex Tillerson to be Secretary of State, a crucial member of President Donald Trump's national security team.

Tillerson was quickly swom in during a ceremony in the Oval Office, where Trump showered him with praise.

"You understand that the job of our diplomats and the mission of the State Department is to serve the interests of the United States of America to make our nation safer, our country more prosperous and our country much more secure," the president told him. "I do believe we can achieve peace and stability in these very, very troubled times."

# 'Trump travel ban 'divisive and wrong'

LONDON - Prime Minister Theresa May on Wednesday told British lawmakers that US President Donald Trump's temporary immigration ban was "divisive and wrong," five days after she initially refused to condemn the move.

"On the policy that President Trump has introduced, this government is clear that that policy is wrong", May told MPs after being pressed by opposition leader Jeremy Corbyn in parliament.

"We believe it is divisive and wrong," she said, speaking to MPs for the first time since the travel ban came into force.

Trump's executive order bars refugee arrivals for at least 120 days and suspends visas from seven Muslim-majority countries



Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan,
 Syria and Yemen -- for 90 days.

The prime minister was keen to emphasise she had no advance notice of Trump's plans.

"If he (Corbyn) is asking me whether I had advance notice of

the ban on refugees, the answer

If he is asking me if I had advance notice that the executive order could affect British citizens, the answer is no."

# HISTORIC MOMENT FOR BRITAIN AS BREXIT BILL PASSED BY MPS

LONDON - Britain passed the point of no return in its historic battle to cut ties with Brussels on Wednesday night as MPs backed the Brexit Bill.

The Commons endorsed the legislation by 498 votes to 114 after the government saw off a desperate bid by more than 100 Remoaners to block it.

In the first of a crucial set of votes in the Commons, a 'wrecking' amendment that would have effectively killed the law was defeated by 336 to 100. The House then gave the Bill its second reading by another huge margin, despite the opposition from Labour MPs, the SNP and most Liberal Democrats.

One Labour MP yelled 'suicide'



as the result was read out in the chamber. Minutes before the vote, two Labour MPs dramatically quit

the frontbench to defy Jeremy Corbyn and vote against the key legislation. Some 33 of the party's MPs backed

the wrecking amendment tabled by the SNP. More are thought to have voted against the Bill's second reading. A handful, such as Chris Bryant and Mary Creagh, opposed the legislation despite their constituents having decisively backed Brexit in the referendum.

Dozens more voted in favour of holding the EU referendum two years ago - but voted against implementing the result.

Just one Tory MP, arch-Europhile Ken Clarke, appears to have joined the Brexit opponents in the division lobbies.

The votes came after two days of bad-tempered and impassioned debate in parliament.



AMONA - Israeli police began evicting dozens of hardline Jewish settlers from a wildcat outpost on Wednesday, just hours after unveiling plans for 3 000 new homes in other West Bank settlements. The announcement of new settler homes was the fourth since US President Donald Trump took office less than two weeks ago, having signalled a softer stance on Israeli settlement building. It was seen as a sop to supporters of the Amona outpost where hundreds of police officers moved in to carry out the evictions after the High Court determined the homes were built on private Palestinian land. *AFP* 

### Iran confirms missile test

TEHRAN - Iran confirmed on Wednesday it had tested a ballistic missile, but denied that was a breach of its 2015 nuclear deal with world powers. The comments from Defence Minister Hossein Dehghan came after the UN Security Council met on Tuesday to discuss the weekend test, which Washington described as absolutely unacceptable. "The action was in line with boosting Iran's defence power and is not in contradiction with the JCPOA (the nuclear deal) or Resolution 2231," Dehghan said. He was referring to a UN Security Council resolution that bans Iran from developing missiles that can carry nuclear warheads. AFP



# Dutch ballots to be counted by hand

THE HAGUE - The Dutch government says it will not use its usual computer software to tally and transmit election results, amid reports that the software is outdated and could easily be hacked. Interior Minister Ronald Plasterk says in a letter to Parliament that "no shadow can be allowed to hang over the result" of the March 15 election. Plasterk says municipalities and electoral regions will now have to tally all votes by hand. Dutch voters mark their choice in red pencil on a ballot paper. Amid fears of possible attempts to hack the results, the Dutch national electoral commission said this week that a computer security company was investigating election software for possible vulnerabilities. That investigation is continuing. AP

### 5 workers killed in India

LUCKNOW - A government official says a six-storey tannery building under construction in northern India has collapsed, killing at least five workers and possibly trapping up to 50 others. District Administrator Kaushal Raj Sharma said the army has been asked to help clear the rubble and search for the missing workers. The building came crashing down in Kanpur, a city in Uttar Pradesh state. AP

# Teacher, two students stabbed at school

SYDNEY - A teacher and two students were stabbed at a high school in Sydney yesterday with a teenager arrested nearby carrying three knives, but police ruled out any terror links. Images from the scene showed a meat cleaver among items seized from the 16-year-old boy, a fellow pupil. "I didn't kill anyone. You have to tell my brother," he was heard saying while being taken away in handcuffs by police, the Sydney Morning Herald reported. AF







# El Hadary heroics defy belief

LIBREVILLE - It is a script that would require a cast-iron suspension of disbelief, but film makers would have no shortage of material to document the exploits of 44-year-old goalkeeper Essam El Hadary, whose heroics helped Egypt reach the African Nations Cup final on Wednesday.

Not satisfied with getting another chance in the national team and breaking the record for the oldest player at a major continental championship, El Hadary saved two spot-kicks as the seven-time champions beat Burkina Faso 4-3 on penalties.

El Hadary, making his 150th international appearance, virtually carried his team to the final with a string of second-half saves in Libreville, keeping the score tied at 1-1 before stopping from Herve Koffi and Bertrand Traore in the shootout.

Flinging himself around his box like a sprightly teenager, El Hadary rebuffed the Burkinabe time and again and was all that stood between his tired-looking side and defeat.

"I had a feeling that I was going to save the final two penalties," El Hadary said after the game.

"A place in Sunday's final in Libreville, where Egypt face either Cameroon or Ghana, offers him a chance to become the first player to win five Nations Cup titles.

His first came as a reserve in 1988, just two years after his debut, but he was at the peak of his career as Egypt won three back-to-back Nations Cup titles between 2006 and 2010.

"When we headed to the penalty shootout, our 2006 title victory crossed my mind," he added. In that final El Hadary saved from Didier Drogba as Egypt edged Ivory Coast 4-2 on post match kicks.

Images of El Hadary celebrating on top of the goalpost remain among the tournament's most endearing.

A recall as back-up in the squad last year and then injury to Ahmed El Shenawy in the first game of the tournament in Gabon opened the door for another remarkable chapter to his career, just two days after he turned 44 on January 15

"I'm happy to be in contention for all of these records but the most important is for Egypt to win the cup," El Hadary told reporters on the eve of Wednesday's semi-final. *Reuters*

# INHO WALKS OUT OF

MANCHESTER - Manchester United Manager Jose Mourinho walked out of a post-match television interview after his side were held to a 0-0 draw by Premier League strugglers Hull City on Wednesday.

United were left four points off the Champions League spots in sixth place after failing to exploit the points dropped the previous evening by leaders Chelsea, Liverpool, Tottenham Hotspur and Arsenal. Mourinho suggested referee Mike Jones had showed Hull too much leniency, but when asked to elaborate, he told a BBC reporter: "If you do not know football, you should not have a microphone in your hand."

He then walked away, cutting the interview short. Mourinho had also accused officials of double standards, citing Liverpool Manager Jurgen Klopp's comment that the fourth official told him "I like your passion" during his

# Arsenal face day of reckoning at Chelsea

LONDON - Arsenal travel across town to a vengeful Chelsea tomorrow knowing that another depressing defeat at Stamford Bridge would see their Premier League title hopes swept away with the lunchtime leftovers.

Victory for Chelsea in the early kickoff will send the Blues 12 points clear at the top and draw a definitive line under the 3-0 mauling Antonio Conte's side suffered at the Emirates in September.

Chelsea went on a 13-match winning run after that setback - their heaviest loss of the campaign so far - and are favourites against third-placed opponents shocked by a stinging 2-1 home loss to Watford in midweek.

"When you lose a match like that (in September) playing for this kind of club, it is very hard to accept," said Chelsea midfielder Nemanja Matic, ahead of a derby that never lacks needle.

"I hoped it was going to be a wakeup call for us and it was... sometimes you have to lose a game to wake up and I am sure we will not allow any more defeats like that one," he told reporters after Chelsea drew 1-1 at Liverpool.

"Are we looking forward to this game even more to put things right? Of course."

Arsenal fans, who still have nightmares about the 6-0 drubbing suffered at Chelsea on Manager Arsene Wenger's 1 000th game in charge in 2014, will be hoping that the Watford result has a similar galvanising effect.

Arsenal

T h e Gunners have not won at their rivals in the league since October but need to do it more than

ever this time if a first title since 2004 is to be anything more than a distant dream this season.

Wenger will not be on the bench, with the Frenchman serving the third game of a four-match touchline ban for his sending off against Burnley, but he will have had plenty to say to his players.

Goalkeeper Petr Cech, returning to his old surroundings, is sure to be pepped up already as will Arsenal's Alexis Sanchez, whose tally of 15 goals currently tops the league scorers standings with Chelsea's Diego Costa.

But Arsenal will need to be fully switched on, mentally as well as physically, to crack a defence that has conceded just 16 goals in 23 matches.

And there are those who doubt Arsenal's ability to put it all together in what could be their toughest test.

"Even Wenger must concede they t need a miracle to

win the Premier League now," commented old foe and former Tottenham Hotspur manager Harry Redknapp in a column for the Evening Standard.

"They have to beat Chelsea on Saturday to have any chance, but the players must be at an all-time low after losing to Watford, who had one win in nine games before Tuesday.

"Their defending for both goals against Watford was shocking and it just makes me think even more that Arsenal's back four is not up to the level needed to win the title."

Wenger has given his players two days rest ahead of the clash, according to media reports. The Gunners will be without injured midfielder Aaron Ramsey and have striker Olivier Giroud doubtful with an ankle knock. © Reuters

# Donald Trump's golf club fined millions of dollars

in Florida on Wednesday ordered a golf club owned by President Donald Trump to pay nearly \$6 million to former members who sought reimbursement of their

The group of about 65 former members of Trump National Jupiter Golf Club had said they wanted to leave the club after Trump bought it from the Ritz-Carlton in 2012.

Rules normally would allow them to keep playing until new members were found. They were paying \$18 000 a year in dues.

But the new management run by Trump changed the rules, refusing to return the deposits to the departing members and barring them from the club.

US District Judge Kenneth Marra

WASHINGTON - A federal court of West Palm Beach ordered Trump's club to pay them \$4.8 million plus some \$925 000 in interest, for a total of \$5.7 million.

"By categorically denying class members all rights to club access because they remained on the resignation waiting list as of December 31, 2012, defendant revoked or cancelled their memberships, thus recalling their memberships," Marra wrote.

"Because defendant did not refund class members' deposits by January 30, 2013, it committed a material breach of the membership agreement going to the essence of the contract, causing plaintiffs and the class members damages measured by the amounts of their refundable deposits plus accruing interest."

Fabrice Ondoa came to Cameroon's rescue in the 60th minute, as he produced a fine save to eep out Mubarak Wakaso's curling freeick.


Cameroon eventually broke the deadlock in the 71st minute as an un-rarked Michael Ngadeu was allowed to slot some at the far post, 1-0.
