WARM TO HOT WEEKEND

FORECASTERS have predicted a warm to hot weekend ahead.

According to information

sourced from Swaziland Meteorology Services the weekend will be warm but hot in the Lowveld on the weekend.

"Tomorrow temperatures will rise up to 29 Degrees Celsius at Big Bend, otherwise it will be warm and mild in Mbabane will have a maximum of 23 Degrees Celsius," said the forecaster. Today, temperatures are expected to reach a maximum of 8/19 Degrees Celsius in the Highveld and 7/26 Degrees Celsius in the Lowveld.

SWINE FLU CASES RISE UP TO 14

The Ministry of Health has confirmed 14 cases of Influenza A (H1N1) (pdm09) strain to-date.

The announcement was made by the Director of Health in the Ministry of Health Dr Vusi Magagula in a press conference yesterday. The first case of Influenza AH1N1 was first reported to the Ministry of Health through the Immediate Disease Notification System (IDNS) a month ago, where a 49- year-old female was diagnosed of Influenza A (H1N1) after presenting flu-like symptoms.

"To-date, the country has reported 14 cases of Influenza A (H1N1) (pdm09) strain. This type of flue is seasonal and has been seen to be occurring in our neighbouring countries like South Africa.

The cases are manageable", said Dr Magagula.

The director highlighted that the cases have been reviewed and all of them were found to be moderate.

He said all the patients who were found with the virus have since fully recovered.

He noted that the government has not posed any travel or trade restrictions, however the ministry continues to monitor fever cases at the points of entry, including the two international airports.

No cause for panic - Dr Magagula

DIRECTOR of Health in the Ministry of Health Dr Vusi Magagula said there is no cause for panic, with the rise in numbers of Influenza A H1N1 cases that has been reported.

He said the ministry has everything under control and there is no need for the public to panic. He said the response of the Influenza A H1N1 is coordinated by the director of Health Services.

He said the ministry has activated the National Epidemic Task Teams which has representatives from the four regions. He revealed that weekly meetings of the Epidemic Task Forces at all levels are conducted to provide updates on the current status and response operations.

"All the health facilities have been sensitised to be on the look-out for any person presenting with flue like symptoms.

The ministry would like to assure the public that inventory of all medication for flulike illnesses has been undertaken and found to be available including the drug of choice Tamiflu", remarked Dr Magagula.

Epidemiologist in the Ministry of Health Nhlanhla Nhlabatsi said the increase in the number of cases is a great thing as it indicates that a lot of people go to health facilities for the check-ups after experiencing prolonged flue. "After the first announcement of the three cases and requesting people to visit the clinics to be checked out, there has been great response, that is how we have been able to get all these cases and have had them tested and treated", he said.

Nhlabatsi revealed that more cases have been reported from the Hhohho region and Manzini region.

He said the youngest patient was a year old, with the oldest aged 61. He added that from their surveillance they discovered that the first case is not related to the other cases that have surfaced.

"From all the 14 cases, only one patient was admitted but was discharged the following day and rest of the patients were given medication", he said

Children, elderly more at risk

DR Vusi Magagula highlighted that people who are a high risk of getting Influenza A are the elderly, pregnant women, people with pre-existing chronic disease like diabetes, HIV/AIDS and children below the age of five years.

"It is advisable that these should urgently seek medical care when they experience flu-like symptoms such as headache, runny nose, sore throat, chills, flushed appearance and feeling very warm or sweating", he said.

Dr Magagula emphasised that everyone is prone to this type of flue and encouraged everyone to practice personal hygiene which is washing of hands with running water and soap, covering the mouth when couching with disposable tissues or clothing and then washing their hands. He also encouraged healthy eating and physical exercise.

"The public is encourage to avoid crowded and poorly ventilates places", he said.

Meanwhile, World Health Organisation (WHO)'s Country Director Dr Tigest Ketsela Mengestu advised people with the flu to drink plenty of water and rest. She said most people will recover within a week.

"Antiviral drugs for influenza can reduce severe complications and deaths although influenza viruses can develop resistance to the drugs.

They are especially important for high-risk groups.

Ideally these drugs need to be administered early, within 48 hours of onset of symptoms). Antibiotics are not effective against influenza viruses", she said.

She highlighted that there are three types of influenza viruses recognised as type A, B, and C.

She said Type A is more common. "The subtypes of influenza A virus currently circulating among humans in Swaziland is influenza A (H1N1).

Circulating

The circulating influenza A (H1N1) is also written as A (H1N1) as it caused the pandemic in 2009 and subsequently replaced the seasonal influenza A (H1N1) virus which had circulated prior to 2009", she said.

She said seasonal influenza is characterised by a sudden onset of fever, cough which is usually dry, headache, muscle and joint pain, severe malaise (feeling unwell), sore throat and a runny nose. Some people may also have vomiting and diarrhea. The cough can be severe and can last two or more weeks.

She said most people recover from fever and other symptoms within a week without requiring medical attention.

"The time from infection to illness, known as the incubation period, is about two days", she said.

23.5% salary hike for public transport operators

KING CALLS FOR REFORM OF UN SECURITY COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP


HIS Majesty King Mswati III has said it is time the United Nations reviews the governing rules of the body and consider opening up the permanent membership so that all the continents are represented.

His Majesty made these remarks at Lozitha Royal Palace yesterday when addressing the High Commissioner of New Zealand Mike Burrell who presented letters of credence to the King.

His Majesty, who is also the Chairman of Southern African Development Community (SADC), applauded New Zealand for the positive role it played while they were non-permanent members of the UN Security Council. His Majesty said New Zealand represented the non-members very well as they did not only look at their interests but also took up issues that affected other continents and countries at the United Nations.

"We are looking forward to the UN reform; this is the African position that is high up on the agenda. It is not only about the five permanent members but we open up to more members as permanent seat holders," he said yesterday.

His Majesty further added; "We

will recall that when the UN started a long time ago there were few members and it was understood why the number of permanent members were restricted to five. We will realise that there has been a significant growth in the membership and it is time there is a fair representation."

His Majesty pointed out that of the current five members, some of the regions are not represented in the permanent seats.

"This is something the UN needs to look at and consider opening up for more members on the permanent seats," he said. "We are all looking forward to seeing these reforms taking place in the not so distant future. We appreciate the role played by New Zealand during their time as non-permanent members."

Position

The SADC Chair said it was the African position that it was time for a review on the issue of seats in the UN. His Majesty, who is also SACU Chairman, expressed the country's appreciation the support it continues

to receive from New Zealand stating that the relations between the two countries must have mutual benefits.

He said with the High Commissioner taking the office, there is a need to explore more areas of cooperation. His Majesty urged the High Commissioner to be the country's ambassador in his country and by inviting potential investors and tourists to visit Swaziland.

"Likewise our people are encouraged to visit New Zealand and look at business opportunities and part-

nership with that country," he said. Meanwhile, the High Commissioner said his country was committed to working with the Kingdom of Swaziland especially in the maintaining and ensuring peace and security in the world at large.

He said New Zealand and Swaziland share a lot in common hence they have a number of similar values which makes the two countries good cooperation partners.

"This relationship is built on shared Commonwealth bonds, our cooperation in international organisations such as United Nations, our shared commitment to peace and security and sustainable economic and social development that benefits all our citizens. New Zealand recently concluded the two-year term as non-permanent member of the UN Security Council. Close engagement with African partners was a priority for New Zealand. We are grateful to Swaziland for the openness to sharing perspective on the regional peace and security in particular the SADC region," he added.

He said his country was committed to working with Swaziland in a number of fields especially in education and agriculture. He said currently, there are two Swazi students studying in his country through the financial aid from his government.

"We are pleased to offer development scholarships for African students to study at our universities. We are keen to explore ways to grow the participation of scholars from Swaziland," he added

The presentation of credentials was witnessed by the acting Prime Ministers Paul Dlamini and acting Foreign Affairs Minister Edgar Hillary, *Emazinyane* and emabandla.

PM's hot debate pushed to Monday

PRIME Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini's hot debate has been deferred to next week Monday by the House of Assembly yesterday.

The debate was supposed to touch on what Members of Parliament (MPs) feel are the inefficiencies of the prime minister and his Cabinet

team

It did not continue because Dlamini left the country on Wednesday for Iran, where he was sent by His Majesty King Mswati III to take part in the inauguration of Iran President Hassan Rouhani.

The debate was supposed to take place through motion 14/2017, which was supposed to be moved by Manzini North MP Jan Sithole. He was supposed to be seconded by Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe.

The motion was to compel the House to debate with the prime minister and his executive on the violation of Parliamentary privileges, inefficiencies and lack of service delivery and prioritisation of the people-focused issues.

The House is also expected to focus on the image of the House of Assembly,

which they feel is no longer respected. The House finally decided to debate the motion on Monday, depending on whether the premier would be back from Iran.

This was not the only motion directed at the premier on yesterday's House of Assembly Order Paper.

The other one is the motion that made some MPs hot under the collar. Motion 12/2017 was supposed to be debated on Monday, after the verbal showdown between the legislators. However, the prime minister left the House while the motion was yet to be debated. The PM left regardless of the fact that MPs tried to remind him that a motion requiring his attention was yet to be debated.

Required

The motion (12/2017) required the prime minister to table before the House, within 14 days, a Bill on the election of the four women on a regional basis, as stipulated in Section 86 of the Constitution Act, 2005. The motion was supposed to be moved by Manzini North MP Jan Sithole and was supposed to be seconded by Matsanjeni North MP Phila Buthelezi.

It must also be noted though that Buthelezi was also among the MPs that were absent yesterday during the sitting of the House. Other items that required the premier's attention were two legislations that were passed by the House of Assembly.

The legislations included the Suppression of Terrorism (Amendment) Bill No. 10 of 2016. The other one is the Public Order Bill No. 8 of 2016.

MPs move towards making SD eligible for AGOA

MEMBERS of Parliament yesterday passed two important legislations that can put the country in a position of being eligible to trade under AGOA.

The African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) is a platform where the United States of America (USA) trades with African countries. The arrangement, which was enacted by the Congress in May 2000, is such that African countries should be able to sell products to the USA, which is considered as one of the largest markets in the

The legislators yesterday passed two legislations, which are part of the four benchmarks that are said to be the bridge towards regaining the AGOA eligibility. One of the two legislations is the Suppression of Terrorism (Amendment) Bill No. 10 of 2016. The other one is the Public Order Bill No. 8 of 2016.

These two legislations, which have been passed with amendments from the Senate, are very close to becoming Acts of Parliament. The only thing left for them is to receive a royal assent. The other two legislations that have to be passed include the Police Service Bill and the Correctional Services Bill. All the four benchmarks are supposed to have been done by next week Tuesday. The last two Bills are said to be at the

Yesterday, Zombodze Emuva MP Titus Thwala tabled reports on the two legislations before the House of Assembly. He was doing that in his capacity as chairperson of the House portfolio committee of the office of the prime minister, which has been responsible for ensuring that the

two legislations were processed to finality. The Zombodze Emuva lawmaker then moved that the House should adopt reports by his portfolio committee on both legislations, in consideration of the amendments by the senators.

He was seconded by Mhlangatane MP Mbalekelwa Ndwandwe. The House finally adopted the reports and that was how the legislations were passed.

By passing these legislations, the MPs have done something in bringing hope to thousands of Swazis who had been affected by the USA's decision to disqualify Swaziland from trading under this programme.

The textile employees were the most affected by this incident because most of the products they produced were sold to the USA markets.

We are aware your country is developed and as we move towards achieving first world status we are also hoping to learn a lot from you especially now that we have officially assumed bilateral relations," His Majesty said. 
The capital and largest city is Tbilisi. The President of the country is Giorgi Margvelashvili who was elected into office in November 2013.

95% SCHOOLS NOW HAVE RECEIVED FOOD

THE ministry of education and training has now delivered food to about 95 per cent of children in schools.

This was revealed yesterday by acting Minister of Education and Training Sibongile Ndlela-Simelane during the debate of the ministry's first quarter performance report yesterday.

The report was debated by MPs who are members of the portfolio

committee

They praised the ministry for such a swift response to the needs of the children in schools.

However, the MPs strongly urged the ministry not to let such a situation happen again in the future.

Disgrace

They said such was a disgrace to the country as it was one of the incidents that could stimulate violence in schools.

Ludzeludze MP Bambumuti Sithole advised the ministry to always ensure that food availed in time in schools.

He said children needed food first before they could undertake any learning process.

He said what made matters worse was that other children did not have food at home and depended on schools to provide them.

Hosea MP Thulani Masuku said the problem could be that during the start of a year, only one third of the money allocated for education would be available.

He said this was also a big problem for the ministry and it needed to be sorted out.

The acting minister promised to provide written answers to the concerns of the MPs.

PIGG'S PEAK HOTEL MAKES E5 MILLION IN THREE MONTHS

PIGG'S PEAK Hotel and Casino is reported to have made E5 million in a space of three months.

This is contained in the ministry of tourism and environmental affairs' first quarter performance report. He said he once went to sleep in that hotel and it was so quiet and he was surprised how so much money could be generated.

Gamedze conformed to the MPs that the E5 million made by the hotel was genuine.

SADC launches pharmaceutical business plan

THE Southern African Development Community (SADC) has launched a pharmaceutical business plan which encourages active private sector participation.

The launch is in line with Article 29 of Component of Protocol on Health (1999) established in August 2004 which places pharmaceuticals as a priority for improving access, affordability, and effectiveness of pharmaceuticals within SADC member states.

Senior Programme Officer, Health and Pharmaceuticals at the SADC Secretariat Joseph Mthetwa said the pharmaceutical business plan aims to harmonize standard treatment guidelines and essential medicine lists, promote research and production of genetics strengthen regulatory capacity and supply chain management systems.

Databank

Mthetwa said through the business plan SADC wants to establish a regional databank of African traditional medicines, and medical plants, develop and retain competent human resources for pharmaceutical programme. He said the plan will facilitate trade in pharmaceuticals within the SADC region and promote operational research in pharmaceutical issues.

"The SADC pharmaceutical business plan recognises that pharmaceutical manufacturing is providing new dimensions and opportunities for growth either in Active Pharmaceutical Ingredients (APIs) or finished products in the region," said Dr Mthetwa.

During the launch, the youth had an opportunity to share their views and experiences on how to develop new ideas to increase the level of public health in pharmaceutical sciences. They also discussed emerging threats for therapeutic failure as a result of limited support to research in Africa and in particular within SADC region.



Minister witnesses violent fans clash in football match

...as they throw beer

bottles during clashes

MINISTER of Commerce, Industry and Trade Jabulani 'Buy Cash' Mabuza witnessed a violent clash between football fans as they hurled beer bottles during a match which he sponsored.

Minister Mabuza is also Member of Parliament for Pigg's Peak Inkhundla. The incident happened at Killarney Sports Ground during a football match between Pigg's Peak United FC and Khanjana Rovers last Saturday.

Sources close to the matter said the minister, who is a co-sponsor of the tournament along with Peak Timbers, watched in disappointment as Pigg's Peak United fans started to get violent throwing beer bottles and other missiles on to

the field.

"It was an awkward case of football related violence and unfortunately happened just metres away from the minister who was seated close to the field of play. After the beer bottles started flying from all directions the minister along with other important dignitaries stood behind the stands.

The fans continued throwing beer bottles at each other but luckily no one was injured as the police were called to the scene to calm the escalating riot," said the source.

Meanwhile, Buy Cash Operations Manager Senzo Nhlabatsi confirmed the incident, saying the teams and their fans had since apologised to the minister and the public for the unfortunate incident.

...says government infringing on their rights


FOLLOWING the arrest of 30 sex workers in Manzini by members of the Royal Swaziland Police, former Minister of Public Works and Transport Ntuthuko Dlamini has come guns blazing condemning the arrest.

Dlamini, who posted his comment in the popular social network, Facebook, says the sex workers had committed no crime because it was their body that they were selling.

The former Lamgabhi Inkhundla member of Parliament even cited the country's Constitution, saying such an arrest was against the Constitution.

He said people are forgetting Section 14 of the country's Constitution. Dlamini called for the sex workers to be freed. He wondered who the complainant in the case against the sex workers was, adding it would be interesting to know who laid the charges.

The former minister went to the extent of saying such could only happen in the

country (referring to the arrest of the sex workers).

Dlamini stated that the sex workers were pushed into sex trade because they were trying to earn a living as there is a high level of unemployment in the country. However, some of Dlamini's friends begged to differ as they stated that there were victimless crimes.

Some stated that the problem with the

sex workers was that they were no longer plying their trade in secret places but were acting as if it is legal to engage in sex trade in the city which results into them being all over the place.

The sex workers were arrested on Wednesday and made their court appearance at the Swazi National Court in Manzini.

'Sigwadzi' tries to kill girl for rejecting his love proposal

IN a rather indecent proposal, a man who could not accept his love proposal being rejected by a young girl did the unthinkable when he attempted to kill the girl.

Zwakele Motsa, who has pleaded guilty to the charge of attempted murder, waylaid the unsuspecting girl when she was going home from school.

When the young girl approached, Motsa stopped her and told her that she was in love with her and pleaded that he accept his pro-

However the *Thulile vehemently told him that she was not interested as she knew nothing about love, school going and young.

However, Motsa seemed not to have taken kindly to the response and dragged the innocent girl to a nearby forest near Landundu River.

In SiSwati, a person who does this is referred to as sigwadzi,

which means someone not successful with his advances to female members.

The young girl screamed for help and as the accused started stabbing her when, another young girl collecting firewood in the forest came to her rescue and that is when the accused bolted away leaving the girl for dead.

Help was sought and Thulile was rushed to the Mankayane Government Hospital, where she was treated before later being referred to the Mbabane Government Hospital for further

Works employee demands E800 000 from govt for wife's fake death

IN a rather shocking revelation, a civil servant under the ministry of public works and transport has tearfully related how the ministry allegedly fraudulently issued a memo to the effect that his wife had died yet she was alive in order to secure financial assistance for the burial of a senior official's maid.

The startling revelation has been made by Manene Gamedze in his application filed at the High Court, where he is seeking an order compelling the ministry to compensate him for damages he suffered as a result of the ministry's alleged action.

He wants government to compensate him to the amount of E800 000 as a result of the injury to his good name as the contents of the memo became widely known and even reached his in-laws who were seriously offended by same.

According to Gamedze of Siphofaneni, in his particulars of claim, the ministry of public works issued a memo on April 2011 falsely stating that his wife had died and he was unaware of the memo until January 2012.

He stated that although his wife Lomagugu Happy Gamedze was sick at that time, she was however alive and had not died. He says the memo by the defendants (principal secretary and ministry) was wrongful and of a defamatory nature to him in that when it was discovered that his wife had not died, this portrayed a dishonest person. Dishonesty

He submitted in his affidavit that as a result of the defendant's actions, his relationship with his in-laws broke down as his in-laws accused him of wishing for his wife's death and accused him of dishonesty.

He further stated in his papers that the memo was allegedly issued for the purposes of securing financial assistance for the burial of a senior official's maid since government could not disburse those funds for the said maid since she could not qualify."The statement by the defendant was to injure my reputation hence the claims of E800 000 for the damages I suffered," Gamedze stated.

He further stated that when his wife eventually died on July 22, 2011 he could not get financial assistance from government as an official because the ministry had already fraudulently lodged the claim using his wife's name who at that

time was still alive.

He stated in his papers that he would have received a total sum of E15 000 for his wife's burial hence he alleged that the defendants are liable to compensate him to a total sum of E815 000 at a rate of nine percent per annum plus cost of suit. Represented by Manzini based lawyer Martin Internash Dlamini, Gamedze was y terday in tears as he related the events that led to his name being allegedly shamed before the

However when the matter was supposed to commence, lawyer Ndabenhle Dlamini from the Attorney General's office applied that it be postponed as his office had not yet prepared to defend the matter.

High Court Judge Doris Tshabalala postponed the matter to September 27, 2017 for hearing and both counsels are to make their submissions.

THE rotting corpse of alleged dagga thief Thembinkosi Magagula has been found on a government cattle farm littered with dagga fields at Bulandzeni.

Sources close to the matter said the decaying corpse was found by a search party at noon yesterday within the very big cattle farm.

"The corpse was discovered by a search party consisting members of the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) as well as members of the public from Bulandzeni. It was found in between rocks already in an advanced state of decomposition.

Police had deployed sniffer dogs to the scene to search for the corpse to no avail from Tuesday but then asked members of the Bulandzeni public to join the search.

It proved a good idea because by noon one of the search teams found the corpse believed to have been rotting for at least three weeks," said the source.

It is believed Magagula was shot for trespassing in a dagga field and then dumped at the site by Mozambican men who were hired to guard the dagga fields that are located on the Swazi Government owned farm called the Ranch added the source.

Confirmed

Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that indeed a man's body was found yesterday.

She said the matter was still under investigation."We want to avoid making too many statements which might jeopardise our investigations," she said.

The discovery of the corpse comes after this newspaper reported that an alleged dagga thief from Bulandzeni had been murdered by four Mozambican men who were hired to protect dagga fields located inside a government farm.

The four are said to have dumped the corpse five metres away from the dagga fields and are still at large as they are reported to have skipped the country.

YOUR NOTE ON DIGITAL GURRENGIES

t is without a doubt that the use of digital currencies has gradually increased and gained worldwide attention. So why are central banks around the world bothered, or not, by this new age currency.

Well, it is basically because of its association with crime especially money laundering as well as an alarming amount of price volatility that has left regulators and financial-market participants wary of its potential implications, and therefore reluctant to embrace it.

Moreover, and according to a statement recently released by the Central Bank of Swaziland, the CBS Order 1974 (as amended) stipulates that only notes and coins issued by the Central Bank shall be legal tender in Swaziland.

Currently, the bank has authorised, as legal tender in Swaziland, the Lilangeni (SZL), as well as the South African Rand (ZAR) which continue to circulate side by side and on par.

Other foreign currencies are traded by licenced institutions in the country in line with applicable exchange control legislation and it is understood that these foreign currencies have, as a key attribute, the feature that they are issued and redeemed by the duly authorised institution in their country of issue and hence enjoy legal tender status, which a crypto currency by definition, does not.

Against this backdrop, technology has significantly transformed the global financial services industry. New and innovative service delivery methods have been introduced and are marked by continuous improvement.

New technologies relevant to the industry include artificial intelligence, block-chain and distributed ledger technology and the emerging digital currencies.

These are all poised to drastically change traditional methods of financial service delivery and will without a doubt enhance the user experience.



DIGITAL CURRENCIES - BY DEFINITION

Digital currencies as defined:

- Are a digital representation of value that can be digitally traded,
- They function as a medium of exchange and
 Are a unit of account and a store of value which does not have legal tender status.

There is a further distinction between centralised and decentralised digital currencies. A key feature of decentralised digital currencies is that they are not centrally owned or controlled by any institution but are issued and facilitated by peer to peer networks of computers using block-chain technology.

This negates the need for intermediaries such as central and commercial banks by placing full and direct control of the currency in the hands of its holders. Some decentralised digital currencies are based on the use of cryptography to control the creation of additional units of the currency and also to record and control transactions carried out on their network. These are called crypto currencies.

THE CENTRAL BANK OF SWAZILAND ON BITCOIN

The bank is aware that Bitcoin is one of the leading crypto currencies globally, and has been advised of instances where this currency is being marketed and traded in Swaziland.

However, the Bank notes like other peer

central banks that due to its nature as a crypto currency, there are no restrictions, disclosures or regulatory compliance applicable to transactions executed using Bitcoin and yet, like any other currency, it can be used for illegal purposes or to facilitate fraudulent activity.

In fact, the anonymity and speed of execution in transacting with crypto currency makes it more susceptible to abuse by unscrupulous persons. This presents a risk to users of the currency because there is no protection or legal recourse available from any institution including the Central Bank in the event that the user suffers financial loss from the use of Bitcoin or any other crypto currency.

The bank is also aware that a few regulators have afforded legal tender status to crypto currency for use in trade while some have also licenced virtual currency exchanges to engage in the trade of the actual crypto currency. This is considered to be one way of mitigating the increased systemic risk that the use of crypto currency could introduce to the economy through, for example, modifying the money supply or facilitating illicit outflows of money.

The general observation globally however is that crypto currency is not yet widely accepted as a form of payment in many markets and as such, it tends to be held for speculative or investment purposes.

In Swaziland the act of collecting deposits from members of the public in exchange for future returns is a regulated activity that requires an appropriate licence to be issued by the regulating authority.

The Central Bank has not yet licenced any person or entity to carry out any activities related to the acquisition, sale and trade of crypto currency, in particular Bitcoin.

It is important then, that you and me recognise the clear distinction between crypto currency and electronic money (e-money).

While crypto currency is denominated in its own units of measure without a central

issuer, electronic money is a digital representation of legal tender and is denominated to the Lilangeni that is issued and redeemed by the Central Bank.

Electronic money is issued, circulated and redeemed within a regulated space by the bank, commercial banks and licensed mobile money operators.

One example of electronic money is the mobile money product whose growth and usage the Bank recognises as a positive development in the financial industry.

In essence, the Central Bank, in line with its mandate to issue and redeem currency as well as to promote safe and accessible payment systems, continues to closely monitor developments in the financial services industry with a view to ensure that the regulatory framework remains relevant and appropriate.

The bank acknowledges its role in supporting innovation and adoption of new technologies in the industry and together with many other regulatory institutions worldwide, adopts an optimistic but cautious view that the financial services industry will certainly benefit from these technologies but that their development and deployment must be done in a manner that sufficiently safeguards the interest of the users. So whether such technology achieves approval from the Bank, remains to be seen at this stage, because of the reasons cited above.

Vimbizibuko residents want indvuna with 'clean' background

RESIDENTS of Vimbizibuko in Lavumisa have said they will not allow Chief of Lavumisa Gasa WaNgwane to appoint someone with questionable background to be an *indvuna*.

Vimbizibuko is one of the mini chiefdoms under Chief GasaWaNgwane.

In all the close to 16 mini-chiefdoms, there are headmen who are answerable to senior *indvuna* at Qomintaba, Chief Gasa WaNgwane's main royal residence.

For all this time, *Indvuna* of Vimbizibuko was Robert 'Mugabe' Mbhamali but due to ill-health he is no longer active, hence there are plans to replace him.

Residents have claimed that someone who was serving in the inner council has already 'appointed' himself as Mbhamali's replacement, and this worlfes/many.

It is said Gadlaza Phakathi who is almember of the inner council, has almounced himself as the new *indvuna* of Vimbizibuko and told anyone questioning this that even the authorities from the main royal residence (Qomintaba) had endorsed him as Mbhamali's replacement.

"We are not going to allow that to happen. He can't just impose himself as we know his background is questionable. Should Gasa WaNgwane go ahead and confirm him to this position, there will be chaos. He can't be *indvuna*, he must just forget. He has no qualities of being *indvuna* and we have many stories about him

some of which when told to the world, Chief Gasa WaNgwane himself can be embarrassed," said one of the residents.

Others claimed that they opposed Phakathi as he was reportedly a member of one of the banned progressive groups.

"How can we be led by someone we know is a member of a political party? How can we be led by someone who we know has no wife or family? Let Gasa WaNgwane appoint him officially, we will tell the world what we know about this man," said another resident.

A number of the residents said they were waiting for the day the chief would arrive at the *umphakatsi* to confirm Phakathi to the position and that would be when hell would break loose.

"Let the chief come to officially announce the new *indvuna*. What he (chief) should know is that should his choice be Gadlaza, of then he should not expect us to be part of that circus. We will boycott anything to do with the chiefdom," said one of the residents. There were already rumours circulating that 'Gadlaza' was supposed to be formally introduced to the residents as new *indvuna* today.

"We heard that he will be introduced soon as Mbhamali's replacement on Friday, and we will be there but should they appoint Gadlaza, let us make it clear now that it is going to be an embarrassing thing as the residents are not going to be part of that circus. We will leave that meeting," another resident said. When called, 'Gadlaza' preferred not to say much, but he won-

dered as to why he was being 'painted' black when he had contributed so much to the community. "I cannot answer what you are asking me but I can only advise you to call Ndzinisa (Fanalakhe) who is senior headman based at Qomintaba," said Gadlaza.

When pressed further about his political beliefs and whether he was indeed a member of any political party, Gadlaza decided to be diplomatic. "Out of all the good things, why are they picking this one as I am one person who has done a lot in this area? I have played football. I have been a prophet and a number of things," said Gadlaza.

Authorities have appointed 'Gadlaza' or anyone

THE leadership of Qomintaba has refuted allegations that a new indvuna has been appointed in one of Chief GasaWaNgwane's mini chiefdoms.

Senior Indvuna of Qomintaba Fanalakhe Ndzinisa said it was not true that the authorities had appointed Robert Mbhamali's replacement who is sickly.

Reacting to reports that Mbhamali's replacement was now known, Ndzinisa denied this saying in as far as Qomintaba authorities were concerned, the position is still vacant. He said no one has been confirmed to the position and was adamant that no one even Gadlaza Phakathi had been endorsed to the position.

"It's all lies.

What I know is that the person you are talking about, is part of 'bandlancane' (inner council). He has not been appointed and as to where those reports come from, I just wonder," said Ndzinisa. Ndzinisa said what he was aware of was

that members of the inner council; were the ones delegating each other on some of the tasks and no one had authority over the other.

"While the position will still be filled, the inner council members are the ones deciding who they send to be their representative on activities touching the umphakatsi. Even when there is an issue here at their headquarters (Qomintaba), they decide who they have to send when there are issues to be discussed.

No one has been appointed as their indvunato replace Mbhamali," said Ndzinisa.

Ndzinisa also refuted the reports that today, the authorities from Qomintaba were planning to visit Vimbizibuko to officially introduce the new indvuna.

"It's all lies as our schedule does not indicate that. There is nothing which has been communicated to me by the chief or anyone that we will at Vimbizibuko on Friday or any other day. There are still more important duties we are busy," said Ndzinisa.

The project was initiated by Umhluma Women and Youth Foundation in partnership with SWIFT and Positive Women Association from UK.


Umhluma Foundation is an organisation which caters for women and the youth in the country.

Go home and die in peace - RFM nurses

A sickly patient got the shock of his life when he was allegedly told by nurses at the Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital in Manzini to go home and die peacefully as he was not going to get help from them because he is too old.

The patient 'heeded' to that advice, and without receiving any help from the hospital, he went home. The old man was saved by Inalda Antonio Jorge, a resident of Ngwane Park, who took him to the Manzini Municipality

In an interview with this publication, Jorge said she took the old man to Nazarene, but when they arrived, she claimed a nurse with an attitude told her that they would not help the patient because he was old. Jorge said she was shocked by the manner and attitude in which the nurse addressed them.

She said they felt dejected and know-

ing very well that little would be done if she registered the complaint, as she once reported a complaint before on another different issue but was told to go investigate it and come up with names. She said she decided to seek services elsewhere. She said she then proceeded to the LaMvelase Clinic where they referred her to Manzini Municipality Clinic.

She said there, they received help as they were given medication and were further advised to bring the patient back the following day.

Jorge who was appalled by the Nazarene nurses' act when interviewed said if one could take his or her time and see the women who had been admitted to maternity wards in the hospital they would be shocked at the way they are treated by the nurses.

She said the attitude the nurses displayed at the hospital was unprofessional and if they could go to work in countries like England they would not last because their attitude would not work there. Jorge further posted the incident on one of the social media

SOME residents in areas under Somntongo constituency have reportedly decided who their next Member of Parliament (MP) will be.

A majority of the people, have publicly declared that the current Indvuna Yenkhundla Dumisani Mbhamali possessed all the qualities of being an MP.

On Saturday, some of the residents found at Emaplotini openly said they had done their assessment and noted that Mbhamali could be their right

They said they were in no way decampaigning anyone or even campaigning for Mbhamali, but they felt he was the right candidate for them.

"We are in no way trying to influence anyone, but we are only saying we appreciate Mbhamali's work. We appreciate what he is doing for us. He

is with us in times of sorrow and also in joy. During difficult times such as when a family is bereaved, he avails himself by means of assisting. He has been doing this even when he was still bucopho and it's not like it's only now that he is of assistance to the community," one of the residents who identified herself as Ntombi Mkholo said.

Before elected Indvuna Yenkhundla, Mbhamali served as bucopho for Vimbizibuko for two terms. He is now popular with most residents and others have already unofficially endorsed him as the next MP.

"He no longer deserves to be in this position but we want to elevate him just like we have done by 'promoting' him from bucopho to be indvuna venkhundla. As we speak, his vehicle is assisting a family which has lost a relative. He has decided to come to this meeting using public transport and this is an indication that he has the interests of the people at heart," said another resident.

Mbhamali was part of the gathering at Emaplotini on Saturday where the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) was conducting its voter education exercise. Even elderly people including one of the elders in the community who identified himself as Timothy 'Ngo 2' Matse said Mbhamali remained their choice as the next MP.

"It's time we elevate him, and what his work has already won our hearts," said Matse.

On the other hand, Mbhamali said he was not ready to go public and announce whether he was ready to take the risk of contesting for the MP's position in 2018.

"I can't go public about my future plans. I can't read much on what these people are saying. We simply have to cross the bridge when we reach it. Right now I am focusing on what I was assigned by the electorates to do," said Mbhamali who is also a pastor.

'Thikazi is still indvuna

MBILANENI Chief Maphumzane has rubbished claims that Indvuna Thami Thikazi has been shown the exit door.

Rumours are all over the area that the leadership is now at crossroads with the headman and what has also fueled the rumours is the issue of the umphakatsi stamp which has allegedly been 'grabbed' from him. Thikazi is also reportedly now a notable absentee in some of the umphakatsi activities including meetings.

The chief said in as far as he was aware, things were still progressing well at the umphakatsi and no changes had been made. He said he was not aware as to where all the rumours were coming from in the first place. "It's business as usual at the umphakatsi and I have not noticed any difference. The chief said he had not even ounced anyone to replace any member of the inner council almost 10 years.

CHIEF of Mvuma, Prince Kekela says chiefdoms in Hhohho are concerned with the large number of foreign nationals who grow dagga in the country.

He was speaking at the ministry of education and training's offices in Pigg's Peak during a stakeholder meeting on Wednesday.

The chief said it should now be known that there is a very serious concern at the various chiefdoms in Hhohho about the large number of foreigners who come to Swaziland to cultivate dagga.

"As Swazis, we cannot look away and act like these things are not happening. The truth of the matter is that there are too many foreign nationals who are now coming to Swaziland particularly in the northern Hhohho region, with the sole purpose of cultivating dagga.

"As we live and work at the various chiefdoms, we have decided to make this problem public knowledge. Just last Wednesday, if I am not mistaken, a South African man was arrested for dagga cultivation and upon further investigations, we heard that the man was from Transkei, South Africa.

"That is worrying as in previous months, we had a Ugandan and a Mozambican national who were also arrested for dagga cultivation. These incidents give Hhohho a bad name and show that foreigners are now infiltrating our fertile land to commit crimes," he said.

The chief said the country's culture does not condone crime in any form, thus such criminal activities must be stopped.

VIRTUAL CURRENCIES AT YOUR OWN RISK, WARNS CBS

AMID the emerging bitcoin frenzy, the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) has warned users that should they suffer financial loss from the use of the currency or any other virtual currency; they will have no protection or legal recourse available from any institution, not even from the bank.

In 2012, the European Central Bank (ECB) defined virtual currency as a type of unregulated, digital money, which is issued and usually controlled by its developers, and is used and accepted among the members of a specific virtual community.

One of the virtual currencies is bitcoin. The digital currency created in 2009, uses decentralised technology for secure payments and storing money that doesn't require banks or people's names.

It is has a range of uses, including funding companies, investing cash and transferring money without fees.

The CBS said it is aware that bitcoin is one of the leading cryptocurrencies globally and has been further

advised of instances where this currency is being marketed and traded in the country.

"However, the bank notes that due to its nature as a cryptocurrency, there are no restrictions, disclosures or regulatory compliance applicable to transactions executed using Bitcoin and yet, like any other currency, it

can be used for illegal purposes or to facilitate fraudulent activity," said the The bank said other CBS.

In fact, the bank said the anonymity and speed of execu- institutions in line with tion in transacting applicable exchange with cryptocurrencies makes it more susceptile to abuse

by unscrupulous persons.

The Central Bank of Swaziland Order of 1974 as amended, stipulates that only notes and coins issued by the CBS shall be legal tender in the country. Therefore, the bank said it has authorised as legal tender the Lilangeni (SZL) as well as the South African Rand (ZAR) which circulate side by side at par.

The bank said other foreign currencies are traded by licensed institutions in line with applicable exchange control legislation.

"It is understood that these foreign currencies have, as a key attribute, the feature that they are issued and redeemed by the duly authorised institution in their country of issue and

hence enjoy legal tender status, which a cryptocurrency by definition, does not," said the CBS.

The CBS has been trusted to issue and redeem currency as well as to promote safe and accessible payment systems.

The bank said it would continue to closely monitor developments with-

in the financial services industry with a view to ensure that the regulatory framework remains relevant and appropriate.

Meanwhile, Swazi Bitclub Network's Prosper Silienou said though there were security concerns all over the world with regards to the use of Bitcoin, it remains one of the safest financial transactions that has ever

He said this was due to blockchain, which is the distributed ledger technology underlying bitcoin.

"That is why many states have aligned themselves with the use of bitcoin," he said. Silienou said they were still trying to open a permanent branch in the country to promote the use of bitcoin.

"We also organise seminars and people have shown interest to join the network. This is a good platform to generate daily income," he said.

For example, he said one bitcoin was equivalent to about E9 240 in local currency around January, but now stands at over E35 640.

"This is huge opportunity for us to create millionaires," he said.

The CBS said it supports innovation and adoption of new technologies in the industry and together with many other regulatory institutions worldwide adopts an optimistic, but cautious view that the financial services industry will certainly benefit from these technologies, but that their development and deployment must be done in a manner that sufficiently safeguard the interest of users.

"The national cooperative development policy entails guidelines on how cooperatives are to be established and nurtured to promote sustainable development. The ministry would like to extend its gratitude to the European Union for financing the development of this policy," he said.

Mabuza emphasised on the importance of cooperatives to the youth and further encouraged them on the benefits that come with being part of it.

"Our focus is on promoting the youth to be involved in developmental initiatives of the country. The ministry wants to ensure that no one is left behind," he said.

The minister said the co ordinating body specifically for cooperatives of the youth formed part of the requirements stipulated in the national co operative development policy.

"The SNYCA is an apex body under which all co-operatives of the youth will affiliate. It will operate more or less like SASCCO," he said. According to Mabuza, for the country to have a federation of cooperatives it needs more apex bodies. "I would like to request members of other cooperatives to contribute towards a fund that will help the young people to lift themselves up. I would also like to request cooperatives to help these young people as they set up through social responsibilities," he said.

He said the youth structure already has 16 registered cooperatives and two school co operatives with a

membership of 289 young peo-

"This in itself indicates the determination of these young people to work and therefore there is a need for financial support," he said.

Young people were further advice to collaborate with other countries that were willing to work with the country.

"I am also advised of a youth cooperative tripartite collaboration between Botswana Lesotho and Swaziland (BOLESWA). It is a good initiative aimed at establishing networks for young cooperators. It's through this forum that

the young people share ideas and experiences for their involvement in cooperatives principle where there is a call for cooperation amongst cooperatives," he said

The minister said the BOLESWA tripartite would also be an exchange programme which will boost trade between the three countries.

"Youth from the three countries will be able to engage in exchange programmes held rotationally between three countries.

Both Botswana and Lesotho have hosted the exchange forum in the past and it is now our turn as a country to host such a forum," he said.

ICT PS lobbies for Mobile Money daily limit increase

MINISTRY of Information, Communications and Technology acting Principal Secretary Bhekithemba Gama has lobbied for the increase of the E4 000 Mobile Money daily for individual transactions.

He said this could add weight on the new partnership between the Swaziland Building Society (SBS) and Swazi MTN which twins Mobile Money wallets with ATMs.

SBS and Swazi MTN recently launched two new products, 'Bank Push-Pull' which exclusively allows SBS account holders to transfer money from their bank accounts to their Mobile Money wallets and vice versa and the Mobile Money ATM cash out, which is a one-time-pin based transaction that allows any registered Mobile Money subscriber to initiate and withdraw at any SBS ATM regardless of their bank

"I would like to ask the CBS to

consider increasing the daily limit for individuals for much convenience in terms of payments," he said.

Mobile Money is regulated by the CBS. Currently individuals are compelled to stagger their payments if they fare above the E4 000 daily limit.

For retail customers, since they are KYC (Know Your Customer) compliant, MTN Chief Consumer Officer Sam Shongwe said their payments are allowed to exceed the stipulated daily limit.

SMME department wants foreigners out of SNL

THE small, micro medium enterprises (SMME) unit under the ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade insists foreigners need to be driven out of Swazi Nation Land (SNL).

In the ministry of commerce, industry and trade first quarter performance report for the 2017/18 financial year, the department said it expects the country's economy to remain in the hands of indigenous Swazis, especially on SNL.

"We expect the country's economy to remain in the hands of indigenous Swazi people through the strengthening of this organisation so that sustainability can be predicted and managed through empowered locals," he said.

The department has the overall responsibility of coordinating the implementation of the SMME policy objectives to foster economic growth and development, increase employment opportunities, alleviate poverty by creating access to sustainable livelihoods and increase levels of ownership in the economy for indigenous Swazis.

The department noted that job creation remains the responsibility of the local private sector and the nation expects full support from government to facilitate the empowerment of citizens interested in engaging in economic activities through entrepreneurship and create the necessary employment and improve performance of SMMEs in the development of the country's economy.

"It is imperative that for the country's economic transition to take serious effect, investment for the SMMEs has to take an elevated level so that the future of the country is predictable," said the department.

Innovative

It also noted that there was a need to put more resources on the youth and allow for the creation of more innovative structures and facilities that shall allow for quick paced service provision and financial inclusion for all the main stakeholders and beneficiaries, especially women and the youth. Small scale credit guarantee repayment stands at 95 per cent

The current repayment rate for the small scale credit guarantee scheme currently sits at 95 per cent.

The scheme is administered by the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) on behalf of government. The report noted that the demand for the facility remains high. "The E5 million recapitalisation by government has to date facilitated for the approval of 30 fresh loans," said the department. However, the department said the insufficient recapitalisation of the schemes remain a risk on all players involved in the scheme. Different banks participate in the scheme.

The department said they were looking forward to a well-oiled financial sector that accommodates financial inclusion for all business citizens. The department said this could contribute significantly to make entrepreneurship to become a culture and wealth creation to eliminate poverty.

SACAU wants agriculture insurance for smallholder farmers

THE Southern African Confederation of Agricultural Unions (SACAU) has joined the global call to make agriculture insurance available as one of the tools to help farmers in general, especially small-holders to adapt to the challenges of climate change.

The global call to action follows a meeting which was held in Bonn, Germany, in May this year where these organisations agreed that a collective effort to support farmers adapt to climate change is required.

"We understand how farmers across southern Africa have been affected by the challenges of climate change. Smallholder farmers are particularly hard hit by extreme climate events, such as drought and odds," said SACAU Chief Executive Officer

"Farmers need to constantly find ways to address these challenges.

Targeted insurance supports climate adaptation by providing funds when farmers are hit by extreme climate events, and by allowing farmers to adopt innovations to exploit opportunities when they are available," he added.

Unlock

SACAU has joined other agricultural and climate change organisations in calling for farmers to have access to insurance products tailored to their 'context special needs that reduce vulnerability, unlock opportunity, spur uptake of climate-smart technologies and practices, and build resilience to a variable and changing climate.'

During the May meeting, the organisations noted that there were already successful examples to emulate in northern Kenya and Ethiopia.

Among the organisations involved in the call for action with SACAU are the CGIAR's Research Programme on Climate Change, Agriculture and Food Security (CCAFS), International Research Institute for Climate and Society, Technical Centre for Agricultural and Rural Cooperation (CTA), Syngenta Foundation for Sustainable Agriculture and the Global Resilience Partnership.

The organisations identified key challenges that need coordinated efforts in order to support farmers.

Risks

According to the SACAU, these areas require designing insurance solutions that equitably address farmers' context-special needs and risks, increasing the availability of data to tailor insurance to the needs of farmers and the risks that are important to them, extending insurance across the full agricultural value chain, including non-farm actors, developing the capacity of existing local distribution channels and potential aggregators, and, creating added

value by integrating insurance with climate-smart technologies, credit, value chains and development strategies

Other areas are ensuring an enabling regulatory environment and creating support for such public-private partnerships and strengthening the evidence base to justify and guide investment, to identify and address market failure.

SACAU said the organisations also highlighted that farmer organisations need to foster two-way communication by promoting understanding of insurance and responsibility to manage risk to farmers, and in turn articulating farmers' needs to insurance providers, governments, and development partners; and, play a proactive role in facilitating data collection and the distribution of insurance.

The call to action also identified specific intervention areas for the private sector, the international development and climate adaptation community and the agricultural research community.

HARARE - President Robert Mugabe's ruling Zanu-PF party had its website hacked and pirated movies and pornographic pictures posted on it, reports say.

The hack on Tuesday appears to have gone undetected for some time, according to news and blogging website Techzim.

Pirated animated movies like Despicable Me 3 and Cars 3 were loaded under the Zanu-PF website's publication section, and pornographic pictures were also posted.

The website was eventually taken down on Tuesday evening and repaired. By Wednesday afternoon, most of its features were back up and running.

"It's hard to determine if the website was specifically targeted or if it was just attacked by bots crawling the internet for websites with

security weaknesses," Techzim said in one of its updates on the incident.

The Zimbabwe government says it wants a Cyber Crime and Computer Bill passed into law before elections in 2018.

Criticism

Critics say the Bill contains lots of vague sections, which could be used to clamp down on freedom of expression, especially on social media where criticism of Mugabe's government and party is robust. But the Bill's proponents, including IT Minister Supa Mandiwanzira, believe it will reduce hacking and cyber-bullying.

"Our people are being abused," he said in June. "They are vulnerable and we need to protect them."

Rwanda set for elections today

RWANDA – Rwanda will hold presidential elections today.

It has been over 20 years since the genocide in the country, but Rwanda still faces wideranging problems.

One of these is a lack of press freedom.

"The reality is the people in Rwanda, they don't have any freedom. As we know very well there is no freedom of expression, no independence of the media.

"All the independent media has been forced into exile except those who are supporting the narrative of the current regime.

Expect

"We can't expect a country like North Korea to have a free election... that's what we're saying in Rwanda where it's using the military to rule the country," said Kennedy Gihana of the Rwanda National Congress.

Rwandan President Paul Kagame, already in power for 17 years, predicts he will win overwhelming popular backing for a third term in elections this week, brushing off accusations of stifling political debate.

Kagame is able to run for the third term only after constitutional changes were approved in a 2015 referendum by what the opposition and Western diplomats described as a suspiciously high 98 per cent vote.

LIBERIA – Liberia's outgoing President, Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, says she will actively campaign for the handful of female candidates contesting elections in October, while her male vice-president seeks to replace her.

There is just a single female candidate among 20 contenders running for president this year in Liberia, as Sirleaf steps down as Africa's first female head of state following more than a decade in power.

Seeking

"I will not be seeking reelection in the October 2017 elections. I will be on my feet everywhere in my own little way to campaign for women listed and certified by the National Elections Commission (NEC) as candidates to participate in the ensuing elections," Sirleaf said in a press statement.

Beyond MacDella Cooper, the former fashion model turned humanitarian running for the presidency, just 15.9 per cent of remaining candidates standing for vice-president and seats in the House of Representatives are women, according to NEC figures.

Crooked Moz cops sent packing after tourist extortion bid

DURBAN - The entire Mozambican police force unit in the popular beachfront tourist resort of Ponta do Ouro has been suspended after local residents accused them of extorting bribes from South African tourists.

Several local business owners welcomed the news on Tuesday, which was featured on Mozambique television and the local newspaper O'Pais.

Their suspension follows the wide dissemination of an amateur cellphone video on social media showing an angry crowd blocking a police vehicle and shouting at officers.

The crowd apparently intervened to rescue a tourist who was about to be dragged to a local police station, where they feared money would be extorted from him.

The Mozambican news agency

AIM reported on Tuesday that corrupt behaviour by some policemen might be a reason for a decline of tourism to "Ponta" – a popular dive spot and beachfront holiday venue for Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal visitors.

The town is just north of the KwaZulu-Natal border at Kosi Bay.

The news agency said that during the weekly police press briefing in Maputo on Tuesday, the spokesperson for the General Command of the police, Claudio Langa, said: "The Command has decided to remove the entire police unit stationed in Ponta de Ouro until the truth of the complaints raised by the public is established. Meanwhile, another unit will be placed there".

Zim bond notes to reach \$0.5bn

HARARE - Zimbabwe's central bank chief says the country will print an extra 300 million dollars' worth of bond notes, despite an earlier promise not to exceed the 200 million figure. Any mention of money printing in Zimbabwe fuels fears of a return to hyper-inflation and the black market trade in scarce foreign currency that peaked in 2008. Bond notes were introduced last November to ease chronic shortages of US Dollars, and to encourage exporters who earn the country foreign currency. The central bank has so far fed 175 million Dollars' worth of the notes, in denominations of two and five dollars, into the economy. News24

Election official was strangled

NAIROBI - An autopsy shows that a murdered Kenyan electoral official crucial to the running of elections next week was tortured then strangled. Christopher Msando's body was identified on Monday at a city morgue. He was in charge of nuning biometric readers and electronic transmission equipment meant to greatly reduce incidences of electoral fraud. Government pathologist Dr Johansen Oduor said on Wednesday that strangulation was the cause of death. Msando also had been hit by a blunt object and had deep cuts on his right arm indicating torture. Oduor says Msando's trachea had collapsed, indicating that he may have been strangled using 'bare hands'.

Libya Societe Generale profit cuts

PARIS - French bank Societe Generale said its net profit tumbled by over a quarter in the second quarter of this year due to the cost of settling a lawsuit with Libya's sovereign wealth

fund. While it had already set aside some funds, Societe Generale had to book a charge of nearly a billion euros against second-quarter profits for the out-of-court



settlement with the Libyan Investment Authority in May. The LIA sued the bank in 2014 for US\$1.5 billion (R19.5 billion) for allegedly channelling bribes to allies of Muammar Gaddafi's son.

Zim to use of foreign currencies

HARARE - Zimbabwe will continue to use the foreign currencies that replaced its local unit until economic fundamentals improve. That is the word from the country's Central Bank Governor John Mangudya. Zimbabwe switched to the US dollar and South African rand eight years ago after inflation hit an annual rate of almost 500 billion per cent. The country experienced a shortage of dollars since early last year, leading to delays in foreign payments, even after the Central bank introduced a bond-note surrogate-currency last November. eNCA

Boko Haram attack kills 6

KANO - A group of Boko Haram gunmen killed six people in northeast Nigeria on Wednesday, a government spokesperson said, as the country works to ramp up its fight against the jihadists. The militants stormed Mildu village near the town of Madagali in the far north of Adamawa state, which has been repeatedly targeted by the Islamists. "The Boko Haram gunmen killed six people and injured three in the attack on the village around 1am," Adamawa state information commissioner Ahmad Sajo told AFP. "The attackers came in large numbers and the security personnel in the area aided by reinforcements engaged them in gunfight," Sajo said. Boko Haram jihadists set 'several homes and shops' on fire, forcing residents to flee, he said. Madagali has been repeatedly attacked by Boko Haram fighters from their Sambisa forest enclave.

Joe Thioloe slams ANC plan for Media Appeals Tribunal

PE TOWN - Press Council cutive Director Joe Thloloe s laid into the idea of a Media Appeals Tribunal, saying an eventual Constitutional Court battle will be a waste of taxpayers' money.

Thloloe was addressing a thousand-strong crowd at a Daily Maverick media event at the Cape Town International Convention Centre.

The veteran journalis and editor said the Appeals Tribun 1 proposal was still South Africa's biggest threat to media freedom.

"It's not just the recent intimidation that is the problem, but the antimedia rhetoric espoused around the tribunal that could fuel the violence aimed at journalists."

The ANC's resolution to introduce a parliamentary appeals tribunal to monitor the media was an undemocratic posture, and very soon journalists "would not be free to do their work in their own country".

"The threat of a Media Appeals Tribunal does not worry me; the Constitutional Court will rule against it," he told the audience.

"But by the time we get to the

DURBAN - President Jacob Zuma's son Edward has finally apologised for his vitriolic open letter in which he attacked senior ANC leaders Pravin Gordhan and Derek Hanekom.

ANC KwaZulu-Natal Spokesman Mdumiseni Ntuli confirmed yesterday morning that Edward had apologised for calling former finance minister Gordhan 'a stooge of white monopoly capital' and former tourism minister Hanekom a 'white Afrikaner askari'.

The ANC in KwaZulu-Natal had given Edward until midnight on Wednesday to retract his letter or face the consequences.

Ntuli said Zuma's son called him yesterday morning informing him that he had sent the letter to the ANC offices on Wednesday.

Apologising

"We did not get a letter on Wednesday but he just gave a call now and forwarded me a letter that he says he sent to the ANC office yesterday apologising," said Ntuli.

He said whether or not Edward's apology made the deadline would not be discussed at the party's provincial executive committee at its meeting this weekend.

Edward on Wednesday said he would only comment on his letter at a press conference he will call soon.

Zuma junior is not entirely off the hook yet as he is still facing an investigation by the SA Human Rights Commission (SAHRC) over "statements that promote hatred based on race".

Chamber of Mines shocked

stop processing any Section 11, new mining right or prospecting right applications submitted by mining companies," Chamber's President Mxolisi Mgojo said.

"In essence, the DMR is implementing the DMR Minister's proposed moratorium on new applications in terms of Section 49 of the MPRDA despite the closing date for comments on the proposal only being today."

This comes as the Chamber last week lodged an urgent interdict in the Pretoria High Court to prevent mineral resources minister Mosebenzi Zwane from implementing a notice to suspend the processing.

Mashaba removes Economic Development MMC for alleged misconduct

JOHANNESBURG - The City of Johannesburg Mayor Herman Mashaba on Wednesday removed mayoral committee member for economic development, Sharon Peetz for "suspected misconduct".

Peetz allegedly falsified a proof of payment to a travel agency to appear that she, and not the city, paid for a family member to accompany her on an official trip to Spain, Mashaba said in a statement on Wednesday evening.

"Through her actions, it is my belief that councillor Peetz has misled myself, the council and the residents of Johannesburg."

He said a forensic investigation revealed that the payment is still

outstanding to the travel agency and that the city has not suffered any monetary losses.

Mashaba appointed Mpho Phalatse as acting mayoral committee member for economic development while a new candidate is considered.

Peetz, a Democratic Alliance (DA) member, has been referred to the party for consideration of further disciplinary action in order to determine her culpability.

She did not respond to messages from News24.

Mashaba said under his leadership the DA-run municipality would not tolerate such conduct, irrespective of political affiliation.

"A new era of accountability has dawned in the City of Johannesburg. Unfortunately, this has not yet removed the dishonesty that drives

the actions of some individuals. It does, however, mean that wherever it is found, action will be taken and our residents will be informed and treated with the respect that they deserve," he said.

Meanwhile, the African National Congress (ANC) has since called on Mashaba to step down, saying that although Peetz's dismissal was long overdue, Mashaba's act was an unimpressive publicity stunt.

"Mashaba pretends to be a man of integrity yet he tried to cover up the story by agreeing with councillor Peetz to repay the money so that the matter could be laid to rest," the ANC said.



The book deal with Mac nillan's Flatiron Books comes three months after Comey's firing raised questions about whether Trump tried to interfere with the Federal Bureau of Investigation's probe into Russia's alleged meddling with the US presidential election. Russia denies any interference, and Trump has denied collusion with Russia and interfering with the investigation. Reuters

Libya naval mission approved

ROME - The Italian parliament gave the goahead on Wednesday to a naval mission aimed at boosting the Libyan coast-guard in its fight against human traffickers and further reducing the number of migrant arrivals on Italy's coasts. Defence Minister Roberta Pinotti said Italy would provide technical support without infringing on the crisis-hit country's sovereignty but would not take part in a "hostile" naval blockade to prevent the departure of migrant boats. The number of arrivals in July was down dramatically on the same month last year, suggesting efforts to close down the Libya-Italy route to Europe by training and equipping the North African country's coastguard could be having an impact



N Korea travel ban deadline

WASHINGTON - The United States on Wednesday officially set a September 1 start date for a ban prohibiting its citizens from traveling to North Korea. "The Department of State has determined that the serious risk to United States nationals of arrest and longterm detention represents imminent danger to the physical safety of United States nationals traveling to and within the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK)," read the restriction as it appeared Wednesday in the US government's rederal register.

Afghan suicide bomber kills 2

KABUL/WASHINGTON - A suicide bomb attack killed two American troops in Afghanistan on Wednesday as they were travelling in a convoy near the airport in the southern city of Kandahar, the US military said, in a strike claimed by the Taliban insurgency. The attack was a reminder of the dangers posed to the 8 400 US forces in Afghanistan as President Donald Trump weighs sending thousands more troops to America's longest war. The goal would be to better assist Afghan forces, who are locked in a stalemate with a resurgent Taliban after nearly 16 years of conflict.

TRUMP SIGNS RUSSIA SANCTIONS INTO LAW

WASHINGTON - US President Donald Trump reluctantly signed off on new sanctions against Russia on Wednesday, bowing to domestic pressure and putting efforts to improve ties with the Kremlin on ice.

Trump signed the legislation behind closed doors and away from the cameras, after failed efforts to scupper or water down the bill.

Trump's reluctance was on full display in an angry signing statement, in which he called the legislation 'significantly flawed'.

"In its haste to pass this legislation, the Congress included a number of clearly unconstitutional provisions," he said, including curbs on the president's ability to conduct foreign policy.

The legislation - which also includes measures against North Korea and Iran - targets the Russian energy sector, giving Washington the ability to sanction companies involved in developing Russian pipelines, and placing curbs on some

Expecting the signature, Moscow preemptively ordered Washington to reduce its diplomatic presence in Russia to 455 persons before September 1 bringing it in line with the size of Russia's mission in the US.

US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said on Tuesday he will meet with his Russian opposite Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov over the weekend, but warned US-Russia ties could still get worse.

Human Rights Watch sounds alarm over Italy's Libya mission

ROME - Human Rights Watch warned on Wednesday that Italy's naval mission to prevent migrants from setting sail from crisis-hit Libya for Europe could see Rome commit human rights abuses.

The Italian parliament earlier gave the goahead to providing technical support to the Libyan coastguard in its fight against human traffickers in the hope it would reduce the number of people arriving on Italy's coasts.

But the American-founded rights group said Rome risked preventing genuine asylum seekers from escaping a country where migrants face detention in squalid camps and abuse at the hands of traffickers.

"The Italian navy deployment in Libyan waters could effectively lead to arbitrary detention of people in abusive conditions," said Judith Sunderland, associate Europe and Central Asia director at Human Rights Watch.

"After years of saving lives at sea, Italy is preparing to help Libyan forces who are known to detain people in conditions that expose them to a real risk of torture, sexual violence, and forced labour," she said.

Such a move "could implicate Italy in human rights abuses".

Italy is expected to begin by sending a logistics ship and patrol boat as well as mechanics to maintain equipment.

HEAVY WEIGHT LEGEND KLITSCHKO RETIRES FROM B

LONDON - Władimir Klitschko has retired from boxing, killing any hope of a rematch with heavyweight king Anthony Joshua.

The Ukrainian was beaten by Joshua in a heavyweight blockbuster back in April and the Brit was eyeing another colossal bout in Las Vegas on November 11.

But the 41-year-old Klitschko has released a video to confirm

his decision to call time on his 21-year career in the ring.

Sportsmail columnist Eddie Hearn, Joshua's promoter, confirmed the Brit must now fight his mandatory IBF challenger Kubrat Pulev in his next fight following the announcement.

'I had a call last night saying he was retiring,' Hearn told talkSPORT.

'Contractually Klitschko had

to take the rematch unless he retired or decided against it. We have been working on it with people in Las Vegas two or three months. We were gearing up for an announcement shortly.

'We'll focus our attention on [mandatory IBF challenger] Kubrat Pulev. When we got the agreement with Klitsckho it was under the provision we'd fight Pulev if it didn't happen.'

The heavyweight legend hangs up his gloves with the stellar record of 64-5-0. 'Dr Steelhammer' ruled the division throughout the 2000s, holding the IBF, WBA,

WBO and IBO titles.

Klitschko burst onto the scene when he claimed gold in the 1996 Olympics in the superheavyweight class. He claimed

his first professional belt just two years later, knocking out Marcus McIntyre, and set about making his mark in the new millennium. Daily Mail



MADRID - Spain's La Liga refused to accept the payment of Neymar's 222 million euro (\$260 million) buyout clause, a league spokesperson confirmed

yesterday, potentially delaying the Brazilian's world record move from Barcelona to Paris Saint-Germain.

"We can confirm that the legal

representatives of the player attended La Liga to pay the clause and this has been rejected," the spokesperson told AFP.

La Liga chief Javier Tebas pre-

viously threatened to file a complaint with UEFA for financial fair play breaches against Paris Saint-Germain over their pursuit of

"La Liga will file this complaint because it's a problem for La Liga's competitiveness. Today it's happened to Barca, tomorrow it could happen to Real Madrid, it's happened to Atletico Madrid," Tebas, the La Liga chairman, told Mundo Deportivo.

Should PSG bid, and then pay, the €222 million needed to prise Neymar from the Catalan capital, they would struggle to meet UEFA's financial fair play conditions that limit a team to losses of no more than €30 million over a three-year cycle. And that is despite a megamoney sponsorship deal with the Qatar tourism board.

According to Tebas, "no-one believes" the commercial revenue figures presented by PSG to justify their spending.

"PSG cannot have figures in which PSG's commercial rights exceed those of Real Madrid and Barcelona," said Tebas.

"No-one believes that. We've carried out economic studies and it's impossible. AFP

side and gave a good account of himself, which left Mourinho purring with delight after the final whistle.


"He needs time but [his] experience, intelligence, a genius in the way he thinks - he thinks football," Mourinho said.


Guardiola left red-faced as he forgets passport



SOCCER - HUB giants Manzini Wanderers defender Brian Vilane says their main objective this season is bringing back the team's glory





LARGE CHUNK OF MONEY SAID TO BE MONEY LOANED TO TEAM BY PLS



WANDERERS (S) E0.5MINTHE RED

SOCCER - OUTGOING Manzini Wanderers directors are said to be leaving the hub giants with an over E500 000 debt.

Information gathered by publication is that a larger chunk of the money is owed by the team to the Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) following a loan given to the team amounting close to E500 000.

A source close to the matter revealed that part of the debt was incurred by the Bheki Shongwe led directorship when they came into office about two years ago.

"The directors are leaving the team with debts amounting to over E0.5 million. Part of this debt was incurred when they took over as directors. It is now not known what will happen next as the directorship structure has been disbanded and the team changed into an association. We are waiting to see how the team will try and settle these debts now that the directors have been shown the exit door," said the source.

The directorship structure was outvoted by the team's supporters during a meeting held over two months ago.

This was after the supporters expressed disappointment on the

structure comprising Sandile

'Chief' Dlamini and Peter Mathaba.
Sought for comment on the matter, Manzini Wanderers General
Manager Patrick Gamedze confirmed that the team was in debt
but was quick to add that the outgoing directors found the team
already in this state.

Partially

He said they partially paid some of the owed money but a portion of it was outstanding.

"It is not the outgoing directors that landed the team in debt but when they took over, the team was already in debt, owing to the fact that there was no proper handover from the previous directors," he said.

Wanderers' co-director Sandile 'Chief' Dlamini said there is no truth in that they owe the team.

"On behalf of the board, I want to say that it is not true that we owe any amount, our financial reports are known to the board only not anyone else," he said.

Meanwhile, PLS Chief Operations Officer (COO) Pat Vilakati said he could not divulge how much Wanderers owed the organisation as such information was confidential.

"The only time the PLS can reveal figures is when a team has been fined otherwise such information is not for public consumption but between the parties involved," he said.
