#### Government still not moving from 0% offer

THE Joint Negotiation Forum (JNF) has again failed to reach an agree-

The public sector associations (PSA) and the government negotiation team (GNT) yesterday convened a meeting after the court ordered that both parties should go back to the negotiations table and negotiate in good faith.

They once again hit a deadlock.

The PSA is made by the Swaziland Nurses Association (SNA), Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP), National Public Services and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) and the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT).

A highly placed source said the meeting between the two parties was far from fruitful as the GNT did not want to barge from their zero percentage for the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA).

"When we resumed the meeting, the GNT Chairman Evart Madlopha produced documents which he said justified that the government cannot afford to offer civil servants anything more than the zero per cent which they have been offering since the beginning of the negotiations process.

This shocked us because the court had asked that we negotiate in good faith," he said.

The source said the PSA took heed to the court's advice and dropped the CoLA request from the original 9.1 per cent to 7.85 per cent cost of living adjust-

"The PSA had the courtesy of dropping 1.3 per cent economic growth from the 9.15 per cent and we were willing to settle for the 7.85 per cent but government refused to barge. The GNT chairman is still maintaining that government has no money and that it cannot offer anything to its workers," he

The source said now that the JNF has failed to reach an agreement, the PSA will on Monday report the outcome of the meeting back to court.

"We refused to sign anything with the GNT. We cannot accept that govemment is giving us zero per cent. Going back to the negotiating table was the court's order and we will definitely go back and report the outcome. It is now in the court's hands on what next will happen.

#### Deadlock

The court will either pronounce a deadlock or something else. We will have to wait and see," he said.

The source further said even though the PSA National Executive Committee (NEC) met to decide on the next step, he believes that if a deadlock is pronounced, the PSA will pursue the matter to arbitration.

It is worth noting that when the cost of living adjustment started, the PSA demanded that government gives civil servants 9.15 per cent adjustment.

Government has from the onset maintained that they had nothing to offer to civil servants as it had no money.

This resulted in both the GNT and PSA snubbing a meeting that was scheduled for September 20 after they failed to reach an agreement.

#### Negotiations

This was the same day on which civil servants marched to the ministry of public service, where they had accompanied the PSA National Executive Committee (NEC) for the CoLA negotiations. JNF Chairman Evart Madlopha in a press statement days later said the march contravened the provisions of the JNF constitution which governed matters of the forum.

"This act on its own is against the spirit of negotiations; clause 6.3 of the JNF Constitution clearly stipulates that "issues that are before the JNF shall been dealt with to finality without the involvement of others unless this is agreed to by the JNF," said Madlopha in the statement.

Madlopha said the GNT raised their concerns regarding the presence of PSA members who he said were not only disturbing the negotiations proceedings but also intimidating the parties.

He said such an act never yields positive results save to frustrate the whole process.

Again on September 27, the PSA and the GNT snubbed a meeting and this resulted in the PSA deciding to take the matter to court, where they wanted the court's intervention on the matter. The PSA wanted the court to order government to go return back to the negotiating table. If government would agree on the 7.85 per cent cost of living adjustment, it would part ways with approximately E450 million to pay the civil servants. In 2016, government spent about E850 million on the salary review which saw civil servants getting anything from 17 per cent increment up to about 30 per cent which was received by politicians.

# TREAT MTN, SWAZI MOBILE EQUALLY - PRINCESS PHUMELEI

Govt shouldn't be seen to be supporting only MTN, Swazi Mobile should also be engaged

NOW that the country has two operational mobile networks, government must not be seen to be supporting one and not the other.

The Government of Swaziland has an obligation to engage fairly both mobile networks in the country for their ser-

Making her submissions during the portfolio committee first quarter debate of the ministry of finance, Senator Princess Phumelele said while it was commendable that the Swaziland Revenue Authority could now collect taxes through Mobile Money, a service provided by MTN, they should in the same vein engage Swazi Mobile.

"We commend the agreement between SRA and MTN but why is this service only offered by MTN because we now have two fully operational mobile networks?" she asked.

She argued that government could not be seen to be taking sides; instead she must engage both companies.

'Government shouldn't be seen to be supporting only MTN, Swazi Mobile should also be engaged," she said.

She further said because now people were spoilt for choice others would soon resort to using one network that better served them, hence the SRA service should be available on both networks.

"What happens when a person decides to use the Swazi Mobile network only, they will not be able to pay their taxes on their mobile phones?" she asked.

On the other hand, Senator David Dlamini who is also the Chairman of the MTN board of directors, applauded the partnership between MTN and SRA saying besides his interests this was a good move as it allowed people to do this from their mobile phones.

"We are moving into an era where

carrying cash is outdated, people swipe and this allows them to pay their taxes from the comfort of their homes," he

Minister Martin Dlamini, responding to this submission said while the concern by the senator was a valid one, Swazi Mobile had not been engaged on the matter because they had no service like Mobile Money and they were fairly new.

"This is a new project we just signed the agreement with MTN. We haven't engaged Swazi Mobile because of two things; they are fairly new and they don't have a tool similar to Mobile Money," he said.

tions to the EBC.

"Why is it taking so long when the constitution was adopted so long ago? Does the ministry want to keep the elections to itself so that it seems like it is working hard or what?" he asked. Responding to the concerns of the senators, the minister said in 2012 the ministry had been advised by the ministry of justice that the constitution did not provide for the local government elections to be run by the EBC. "In 2012 because we wanted to implement this but were advised that the constitution wasn't clear

on local elections hence they must not be conducted by the EBC until an Act providing for such is in place," he said.

Mabuza said they had again this year engaged the EBC on what should be done but were advised that the elections should be conducted by the ministry.

"We wanted to touch base if they had been advised any differently. However, one can point out that even though we are conducting the elections we are in constant contact with the EBC, we turn to them for guidance and advice," he said.

# SOLDIERS IN SHOOT-OUT, HIGH

THERE was drama when soldiers and a well-known bunch of dagga gangsters engaged in a high speed chase and shooting along the Mahamba/Nhlangano road.

This happened on Tuesday at around 8:30pm.

At the centre of the shooting and high speed chase were about six bags of dagga that were impounded by the army personnel at the Mahamba Border Gate.

Sources close to the matter told this newspaper that members of the army seized the bags of dagga that weighed 91kg at the border gate and were transporting it to Nhlangano when the gangsters emerged in speeding vehicles.

The gangsters were allegedly driving in a van, Audi and another vehicle that was not identified.

The speeding cars in particular the Audi attempted to block the way of the soldiers' vehicle. Sensing danger, the soldiers are said to have fired two warning shots.

Out of panic, the gangsters' van rammed into the Audi causing an accident.

Two gangsters were injured in the

#### Dead truck driver is Robert Dlamini

THE driver of one the two horse and trail trucks that were involved in a nasty head-on collision resulting in both bursting into flames along the Hhelehhele/Siphofaneni road has been identified.

His name is Robert Dlamini of Makhwelela. He was the unlucky driver who could not escape the claws of death when the two trucks collided on Monday evening next to Joy Mission. Dlamini was certified dead on arrival at Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital.

The other driver who survived the accident with serious injuries was identified on the day of the accident as a 37-year-old man of Bethany. He is currently is recuperating at RFM Hospital.

Chief Police Information and Officer Communications Superintendent Khulani Mamba said through investigations the police were able to trace the relatives of the driver who died in the spine chilling accident.

"The police have taken the relatives of the deceased to the scene of the accident, near Joy Mission and they will be taken to Dups Funeral to identify the body of the deceased," said Mamba.

Both trucks that were involved in the head-on collision caught fire and were burnt beyond recognitionin in a way that police could not even identify what the trucks were ferrying.

#### Soldiers always ready for any criminal hazards

THE troops managed to save the six bags of dagga from possible capture by the six men involved in the four-car high speed chase and shooting with only two soldiers.

This number was confirmed by Swaziland Umbutfo Defence Force (SDF) Acting PRO Nkosinathi Dlamini.

"Yes I can confirm that there were only two soldiers transporting the dagga in the car. However that should not mean that people should take chances," he said. He added that troops are always ready for any hazards confronting them. "Our mandate is never to kill but protect, so we carry guns to protect, which is why

we even fired warning shots. We only shoot when the opposition starts firing back at us," Dlamini added. The injured are said to have been rushed to Nhlangano Health Centre where they are currently receiving treatment. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba also con-

firmed the incident and added that they have opened a commission of inquiry into the matter.

"I can confirm that we attended a road accident scene where two cars were involved in a collision. The four occupants were transferred to Nhlangano Health Centre for treatment," Mamba confirmed.

#### Judge Hlophe, 'Tsotsi' in court showdown

THE marathon car theft trial involving businessman Mfankhona Dlamini known as 'Kakona' yesterday saw a High Court Judge and Advocate Mduduzi 'Tsotsi' Mabila engaged in a heated argument that resulted in the court adjourning for a while.

The heated exchange between Judge Nkululeko Hlophe and Advocate Mabila emanated from an application that was moved by the latter to the effect that a car that is amongst those alleged to be stolen by the accused person, be brought to court to confirm that it was not stolen but clean as it was bought from the CTA. The CTA is the Central Transport Administration which normally conducts public auction sales for old and damaged government vehicles.

Mabila applied that the car, a Toyota Hilux be brought to court in order to show that its chassis number was not tempered with as part of the evidence brought before court was to the effect that the car's chassis had been tempered with. However, Mabila submitted before court that same was never tempered with and that the car was never stolen

hence it should be brought to court in Malkerns. order to prove that.

Judge Hlophe asked Mabila if such was necessary and wondered why these questions were arising at this stage.

Mabila submitted that the court had earlier on said that they as defence should make the application to have the vehicle brought before court if the need arose hence they were moving same in order to prove that the number on the chassis was never tempered with.

At this stage Judge Hlophe told Mabila that he should not worry if chassis number was not tempered with, but Mabila insisted that they are moving the application because the issue was contentious following their inspection in loco at

"We are all officers of this court and have a right to bring exhibits for evidence purposes, we cannot take chances on this one since we want to prove that the numbers were not tempered with and further request the Toyota expert, Naidoo to be brought to court to state whether the numbers were tempered with or not," Mabila submitted.

This was when Judge Hlophe told Mabila that he has put the cart before the horse and accused Mabila of black mailing him and stressed that he was making a ruling on record in this matter to the effect that the application to have the car brought shall be made when the need arises.

# Asian who tried to bribe Bennett loses over E600 000 to the state

A Matsapha based Asian businessman who attempted to bribe former senator and auctioneer Walter Bennett was yesterday sentenced to two months in jail.

He will also forfeit E650 000 to the state

The Asian was caught up in a public auction bribery incident in which he tried to bribe his way with E150 000 to lay his hands on SPTC cooper wires worth E3 million during the auction sale.

Charged with Contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006, Patel Akther Hussein of IMM Investments bribed the auctioneer by offering him E150 000 to pay E700 000 for the copper wire worth E3 million.

The copper wire belonged to the Swaziland Post and Telecommunications Corporation (SPTC).

Represented by Manzini based lawyer Sabelo Mngometulu, Patel yesterday appeared at the High Court where he pleaded guilty to the charge of contravening the Act. High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi, following his plea, convicted him as charged after evidence had been led and he was sentenced to two months in

prison which was however wholly suspended for a period of two years on condition that he is not found to have committed a similar offence. The monies to the amount of E650 000 which were paid by the businessman in respect of the auction deal that went wrong, had been forfeited to the state as per an order of court. Patel could not believe it when he was told by Judge Nkosi that he was a free man yesterday as he was seen

bowing down in respect and rushing to the exit at Court D, joined by his fellow countrymen and business associates. "I will never commit such a crime, thank you my Lord," Patel said when jumping out of the accused dock after mitigation, conviction and sentencing.

As part of his mitigating factors, Patel told the court that he is a sickly person who is diabetic, has children and his business to look after and that a custodial sentence would not be conducive to his health.

People charged under the Prevention of Corruption Act can face a sentence of up to 10 years in prison with a fine option to pay E100 000 or both. He had been initially co- charged with two of his business associates who however had their charges withdrawn by the

### SRA Ombudsman coming

The Ministry of Finance will soon table the Swaziland Revenue Authority Amendment Bill that will set up the Tax Ombudsman.

People who are not satisfied with how their taxes are collected will soon have a platform where they can lodge their complaints.

According to the Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini the ministry is working around the clock so that the SRA Amendment Bill is tabled before Parliament and passed into an Act so that the ordinary citizen can have a platform where they report the SRA where they believe there was wrong doing as far as tax collected from them is concerned.

"We are still pushing here in Parliament for the Bill that will help us set the Tax Ombudsman where people can run to in the event they feel cheated by the Swaziland Revenue Authority," he said.

Dlamini was responding to submissions made by senators during the portfolio committee first quar-

The senators had wanted to know why such a structure was not in place.

Senator David Dlamini debating the ministry's

debate wanted to know how far the ministry has gone in forming the ombudsman's office.

"I understand that there must be some form of a tax tribunal where people can lodge whatever complaints they have over their taxes. How far has government done with setting up this structure?" he

Prince Kusa also asked the same question saying

that Swazis were disgruntled with the manner in which SRA was conducting business hence they needed a structure where they could lodge their complaints.

"Swazis are disgruntled hence a structure like this is necessary so they are able to complain," he said


The police first asked the woman why she was parked there as it is not a safe place.

# STUDENT TO SPEND FOUR YEARS IN JAIL FOR CAR ROBBERY

A college student will spent four years in a correctional facility without the option of a fine for

Melusi Ginindza (27) was sentenced together with Sicelo Matsebula (29) who is a mechanic, for stealing a vehicle and cash from a couple at Matsapha.

Ginindza, who had already applied at one of the colleges in Manzini for the August intake this year, appeared in court with his partner in crime Matsebula before Magistrate Lucia Lukhele at the Matsapha Circuit Court yesterday.

Money awong and

They were charged with robbery in that they robbed a man of his vehicle, a Kia Rib valued at E42 000 and money in cash to the value of E800 while at Mhlaleni area.

The two are said to have robbed the complainant of his vehicle by pretending to help him pass through a police roadblock.

One of the accused, who was turned to a state witness, informed the court



that they found the accused's vehicle parked at Mhlaleni near a grocery shop known as 'Sigud Snayisi'.

The accused are said to have walked up to the complainant identified as Ndwandwe and asked him if he was parked next to the road to avoid the road block which was set up by the police ahead and the complainant responded to the affirmative.

#### Girlfriend

He told the accused persons that he was drunk and was afraid to drive because the police were going to arrest him.

He then asked the accused to drive for him until they pass the police at Mhlaleni. The witness told the court that the accused persons agreed and once they had passed the police, the complainant paid them E60 for driving him and his girlfriend.

However, when it was time for the accused to alight from the vehicle, they then hijacked the accused and robbed him of his vehicle at knife point, leaving the couple stranded at in the middle of the night.

The court was further informed that not only did the accused rob the complainant of his vehicle, but they also took money in cash amounting to E800 which was inside the

The accused drove off to Fairview area where they spent the money on alcohol at a sheebeen until the morning. The accused then proceeded to another Sithole homestead where they took number plates from a vehicle, a Kia Rio which was similar to the one they stole and swapped them with those of the stolen vehicle.

The accused were later caught by the police after the complainant opened a case with them.

The car was later discovered hidden at a homestead with a wall fence and the accused were arrested while hiding in the mountains.

During their appearance before court, the accused pleaded not guilty to the charges of robbery. They informed the court that they were only helping the complainant.

Ginindza, in particular, pleaded for mercy, adding that he was supposed to be at college as he was admitted for an ICT programme. Matsebula said he was self-employed and earned a living through fixing cars. However, the court informed the accused that robbery sentences had no fine option. Accordingly, they were found guilty and sentenced to four years imprisonment without an option of a fine.

#### It's World Teachers' Day today!

TODAY, the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) is commemorating the 2017 World Teachers' Day.

This year's theme is "teaching in freedom, empowering teacher."

However, SNAT will stage the celebrations during its 20th anniversary on October 13, at Mcozini High School.

SNAT Secretary General Zwelithini Mndzebele said the importance of commemorating World Teachers' Day could never be overemphasised, and as such they would join other teacher organisations around the world to celebrate the day.

Success

"It is a day in which teachers reflect on past challenges and successes as they go about discharging their duties.

The 2017 commemoration is made in light of the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and their targets, especially goal number four. which advocates for inclusive and equitable quality education and promotion of lifelong learning opportunities for all. This year's theme connects well with the aims of Education International, especially those that have been highlighted earlier," said Mndzebele.

He said imparting knowledge to learners thrives well under specified conditions and one of those was the freedom of the educator and that of the learner.

He said the assimilation of knowledge by the learner was enhanced if he or she was provided with a wide array of concepts and then makes an analysis of all of them.

"The censorship of teachers in terms of what they teach and which books they utilise, with what content, indisputably compromises the freedom in teaching.

The censorship of education is tantamount to indoctrination and citizens who are a product of this kind of an education system, will be social misfits. If Swaziland is to remain a truly developmental state, greater freedom must be afforded to teaching and to teachers," he said.

Mndzebele said SDG 4 entailed that the teacher was actually at the centre of the education sys-

He said a well remunerated teacher would have a high morale and motivation.

"A highly qualified teacher will always be effective in handling and delivering this public good. Governments must ensure that the empowerment of teachers remains key in all educational programmes and the national priorities must be set in such a way that they put more emphasis on teacher empowerment and development.

#### Education

The dynamic nature of education requires an empowered people," he said.

He further commended government for motivating teachers to learn and broaden their academic horizons. However, he said there were deep-seated problems when it comes to the remuneration of these educators and this has been a perennial challenge which needs to be addressed. Mndzebele said in remote schools there was lack of running water, electricity. decent housing and impassable roads.

These challenges, together with many others, are demotivating to the educators of this country.

Teachers, therefore, find themselves having to sacrifice a lot with their resources so as to impart education to the Swazi child. As SNAT, we, therefore, demand that government invests significantly on education since it is a public good," he said.

#### Three men charged with 4 counts including attempted murder

THREE men aged between the ages of 19 and 23 have been charged with four counts, including attempted murder.

Following a gang war on Sunday which exploded from one of the drinking holes at Mvutshini, two men have been hospitalised whilst the three young men stand accused of bringing terror to Mvutshini and Somnjalose, places found in Ezulwini.

Two of the three men, Lungelo Kunene (19) of Somnjalose and Sihle Ndzima (23) of Mvutshini are facing a serious charge of attempted murder after they allegedly assaulted Sifiso Magongo on Sunday and further stabbed him once on his head using a knife.

They are alleged to have then used a golf stick and a knobkerrie to hit him on his head and sevand a knobkerie cal times on his body.

Harm

The third suspect, Linda Mkhize (21) of Somnjalose, only faces three counts where it is alleged whilst working hand-in-hand with the other suspects, they assaulted Musa Matsenjwa on his head.

The gang is alleged to have further vandalised his door worth E5 500 and thus were charged with malicious injury to property and assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

They were further slapped with another count of malicious injury to property after they allegedly attacked Lucky Matsenjwa whilst at his home. They are said to have damaged his door lock and window worth E4 500 as they forced entry to his house. The young men represented themselves as they appeared before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini. They were remanded into custody until Monday, pending recovery of the two complainants who are currently hospitalised.

The arrest came after two gangs allegedly fought over spilling of alcohol on Sunday night.

The arrested suspects are said to be amongst the six-gang member that attacked the complainants who are part of the opposing gang when the fight

### SNAT condemns tertiary crisis

THE Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) has blamed government for the education crisis reported in the country.

The calamity has seen a number of tertiary institutions indefinitely closing down.

SNAT Secretary General Zwelithini Mndzebele said as they commemorated the World Teachers' Day today, it is distressing that it is at the same ilme when government had endangered an unparallel crisis in the training institutions around the country.

#### **Future**

Tertiary institutions that are currently closed are William Pitcher, Swaziland College of Technology (SCOT) and Swaziland Christian University (SCU), while the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) students are boycotting classes.

"Scholarships are not availed to all deserving tertiary students and by doing this, the govern-

ment deprives the country of the rich pool of capability that these young adults can provide in the future. Tertiary education is too expensive and cannot be afforded by a middle class parent who has a kid in tertiary institution. As a country, we have been complaining about the lack of training institutions and the fact that the curriculum that is offered therein is irrelevant to the needs of the time," said Mndzebele.

#### Audit

Mndzebele said when institutions such as the SCU opened, people believed that the country had made a milestone achieve-

"However, at present the institution has been closed down and a number of Swazi children have been left stranded. The reason behind the closure of the institution is unclear. In fact, if an audit of all the training institutions could be made, it may not be surprising that all of those that are in operation might as well be closed down," he said.

Mndzebele said most of the tertiary institutions had dilapidated structures and yet education that is offered by them has been made to be too expen-

He pointed out that the failure by government to release personal allowances to the learners in good time to facilitate learning has led to some institutions to be riddled with class boycotts.

He said SNAT believed government was responsible for the education crisis in the institutions. The government, he said, decided not to consult stakeholders on anything pertaining education.

Mndzebele said as SNAT they demanded that government reopens the SCU immediately. "Government must also bring stability to the other training institutions around the country. It should also make sure that all deserving tertiary students are provided with tuition instead of availing same to a selected few," he said.

# NATION FROWNS AT RISE IN RHINO POACHING - JUDGE

HIGH Court Judge Sipho Nkosi has expressed concern over the continued poaching of rhino, adding that the nation frowns at such a criminal offence.

Judge Nkosi who was supposed to make a ruling in the long going suspect rhino poachers bail application, told the suspects that it pains to see one of the big five (rhino) laying down with its horn missing after having been killed.

"The nation hates such poaching, these animals are for Ingwenyama and the Swazi nation and for people to come from as far as South Africa to poach is so bad," Judge Nkosi said.

This was after the Judge had noted that the crown and defence counsel have filed all their papers and the issue which had all along been dragging the application has been set aside for the trial court to deal with.

This is the issue of evidence that was expected to be given by Fana Mbatha, the Hlane Game Park ranger who is alleged to have entrapped the four into poaching before rangers allegedly showered them with bullets killing two suspect poachers in the process.

The four will now know their fate on tomorrow following the submissions that have come into finality after the bail



application that was filed a month ago. The court had expressed concern over the additional charge of murder instituted by the crown in its amended charge sheet for four suspect rhino poachers.

#### Wondered

Judge Nkosi who was supposed to make a ruling in an application filed by four of the suspects, wondered from the crown as to how the four suspects Stanley Nhlakalufu, Isaac Mkhabela, Muzi Dlamini and Sipho Mhlanga have now been charged with the murder of two suspected poachers they were with in the alleged poaching.

This, after he noted that the shooting that resulted in the death of two Mozambican nationals who were allegedly part of the team of poachers, was directly made by the rangers and the police officers.

Judge Nkosi who was supposed to make the ruling yesterday postponed it to tomorrow (Friday) as he mentioned that the crown has since noted that the issue of the charges they have added is that of the trial court. Representing the four in the matter is lawyer Machawe Sithole while the crown is represented by Patrick Mkhatjwa.

Dlamini said SWA-CAA has therefore found it proper to afford the children the full experience of an airport's operations. He explained that interested schools would have to register with

the SWACAA offices and make arrangements on the schedules.

Dlamini addressed concerns which are to the effect that some people were of the view that using flights in the country tend to be a long process as one would have to wait for hours at the airport before a flight takes off.

He stated that familiarising the public with the operations of an air-

port was one other way of addressing this issue. "With more people using flights, the intervals of departures and arrivals will be subsequently improved," said Dlamini. He further pointed out the benefits of more people preferring to use flights as compared to road trips.

Meanwhile, Dlamini said they have engaged a private pilot for the schools' touring rides.

# Escalating rate of teenage pregnancy worries DPM

THE alarming rates of teenage pregnancy in the country must be looked into.

The office of the Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) has been implored to come up with means to mitigate the situation because at the rate things were happening, the country was in danger.

Speaking yesterday during the portolio committee first quarter debate of the DPM's Office, Prince Fipha said he read with dismay at reports that in one school 31 pupils were pregnant in just this year.

He said what disturbed him further was the realisation that the pregnancy rate was not high in this school only, but it was a countrywide problem.

"The fact that pupils are being impregnated and in turn drop out of school is alarming and it's everywhere. I am worried, where are we headed to as a country if such things are happening?" he asked.

He pointed out that in yesteryears things like this did not occur as children did not have children of their own as is the case now. He said this showed that there was a problem somewhere and the DPM's Office should look into it.

'As the office in charge of the social welfare of children, it is important that you look into this matter as it shows that there is a problem somewhere. It is very important that government looks into it especially now because it (government) is the one paying for most pupils' education, because if they are dropping out, then we are not serious. Government should not be paying for pupils through primary only for them to drop out in high school because they are pregnant. Government must look into this teenage pregnancies and how they can be curbed," he said.

Responding to Prince Fipha's submissions, DPM Paul Dlamini said his office was also concerned with ...DPM's office has been implored to come up with a solution because at the rate things were happening, the country was in danger

the alarming rates, however, it was hard to curb such.

"The issue of teenage pregnancy is a complicated one, we realise that the numbers are high but we cannot fight this problem on our own. It boils down to parenting. Parents need to get to a point where they sit their children down and speak to them about issues such as pregnancy," he said.

He further lamented the fact that it was not the pupils' age mates that impregnated the young girls, but it was grown men.

"Growing up we were parented by any elder but now elders see young girls and see wives. The world is corrupt," he said.


On another note, the DPM said government was working around the clock to make means of dealing with fathers or parents that neglected their children.

He said the issue of negligence by parents (failing to maintain your child) was a very sensitive one, hence it was important that it be handled with the same sensitivity it deserved.

He stated that they were currently consulting stakeholders on how this issue could best be handled while protecting the child's life and rights. Dlamini noted that in other instances, children had been killed by a negligent or frustrated parent.

"It's a very sensitive matter, we are currently in the process of consulting on how best these issues could be dealt with," he said.

The DPM was responding to a submission made by Senator Lungile Gama on why there was no ACT in line with child maintenance because too many fathers were running away from this responsibili-



# GOVERNMENT TO ESTABLISH WITNESS PROTECTION OFFICE

IN an effort to protect witnesses during prosecutions, the government now wants to establish a witness protection office.

The office will be established with the intention of protecting witnesses and their relatives during prosecutions of serious crimes.

The office will be established under the Witness Protection Bill No. 5 of 2016, which might be enacted into a Witness Protection Act, 2016, if things go according to plan.

Currently, the Bill is still in Parliament, where it is being processed into an Act. The portfolio committee of the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs has tabled a report where it had been debating the Bill. The

House of Assembly is expected to debate and adopt the Bill, with an intention to enact it as legislation. After that, the legislation will go to the upper chamber, the Senate.

The objectives of the Bill includes

establishment of the witness protection programme in Swaziland by making provision for the protection of witnesses in serious offences, who are under threat.

The Bill also aims to encourage mem-

bers of the public to give evidence as witnesses in criminal cases by offering effective protection to them.

According to the Bill, there will be an appointment of a director to be appointed by a minister for justice and constitutional affairs.

The director will be responsible for formulating and making sure that programmes of the office and that of protecting witnesses are fully followed. The Bill would also provide for matters incidental to or connected therewith.

Minister for Justice and Constitutional Affairs Edgar Hillary pleaded with the legislators to speed up the process of enacting the legislation.

Hillary said the criminal justice system, in the prevention and prosecution of crime, was faced with the challenge of obtaining the cooperation of witnesses and victims. "Witnesses in serious offences are often reluctant to give information and evidence because of perceived and actual intimidation against themselves or their family members. Witnesses who receive care and support are more likely to cooperate with the justice system in the prosecution of offenders," Hillary said.

The minister said prosecution of serious and organised crimes could be very dangerous. Organised crimes were committed by highly connected and international gangs which had a lot of resources in different countries and places.

In some cases, the gang had more resources than the governments which had the responsibility of bringing the gang to justice. The criminals would do anything to avoid prosecution or, at most, conviction. Investigators, prosecutors, witnesses, and even presiding officers and their families could be harmed by the perpetrators of the crimes.

Hillary said it would be imperative for the country to put in place measures to protect witnesses, whose lives could be in danger.

The witness protection office, according to the minister, would help the country achieve this objective.

In the energy sector, the region currently has a total installed power generation capacity estimated at 65 791 megawatts as at the end of 2016. This is a 36 per cent increase from 2012 figures of 48 352 megawatts.

On ICT, COMESA countries represent 37 per cent of the internet users in Africa. There is therefore needed to do more to enable majority of Africans have access to ICT services.

At the meeting, the ministers were taken through a new transport system known as the Futran. The system which was developed in South Africa seeks to address the need for a new class of cost effective large scale transportation systems in Africa especially for densely populated cities. It can be applied to bulk freight, factories and warehouses, and public transport.

Once implemented the Futran System shall provide efficient, cost effective, transportation for the goods from points production to market places at very low costs and provide affordable rates for passengers.

### Mpolonjeni land dispute far from over

A land dispute at Mpolonjeni is far from being over as the man who lost a court battle in 2013 is back in court and wants the court order issued in March, 2013 removed.

Maxwell Masuku is adamant that the court had no jurisdiction to grant Patrick Masuku a court order pertaining a land dispute at Mpolonjeni as the matter was supposed to be deliberated by the Mpolonjeni umphakatsi as they are fully aware of the rightful owner of the land.

Masuku moved an application highlighting his concerns that when the court

was not aware, even though he was present in court on this very same day.

He said he was only served with an application for an order interdicting and restraining him and others from threatening or destroying any structure of Patrick Masuku on Swazi National Land at Mpolonjeni area under Ekupheleni Chiefdom.

Interfering

Another order sought was one interdicting and restraining him and others from interfering with the applicant's rights to occupy the said land in any manner whatsoever.

Masuku said he was shocked the original file had an entry that an order was

order was issued on March 10, 2013 he issued on March 20, 2013. He said he was in court on that day and before Senior Magistrate Phathaphatha Mdluli who referred the matter to the umphakatsi and refused to grant the orders sought by the respondent since they touched upon Swazi Law and Custom. Masuku said he was never served with the order said to be issued by Magistrate Dlamini and he further argued that when the respondent was invited to the umphakatsi he never talked about the court order which was issued in his favour.

He said when the respondent was told by the community police to stop any activity on the land in question, he heeded and never told them about the court order. Masuku said the court made

the court the matter was being dealt with by his umphakatsi. However, he was told by Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini to secure services of an attorney as the matter was now in court.



# 'My father wants me dead'

A man who was arrested for damaging his father's property has claimed that his stepmother plans to kill him.

Ndumiso Gwebu (33) from Mayiwane had appeared in the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court on Monday after being arrested for destroying his father's property worth about E6 000.

Gwebu said after consulting a traditional healer in Mayiwane, he was informed that both his biological father and his stepmother wanted him dead.

"I was arrested at my parental home-

stead in Mayiwane for destroying a sofa and a fridge belonging to my father. Both these items have a combined cost of E6 000, but they were not destroyed. What happened was, I was just sitting on the sofa taking care of a toothache, then I got up and went to the fridge and I struck the corner of its door with a kitchen chair, that is when my step mother then called the police to have me arrested for the damage of the property," he said.

Gwebu said the real problem they had as a family was that after consulting a traditional healer, he was told that his parents wanted him dead for helping his biological mother. He claimed to have been avoiding both his father and stepmother.

Pigg's Peak Magistrate Simangele Mbatha advised Gwebu against placing all his faith in traditional healers who sometimes operate as 'prophets of doom'

"You should not place all your faith in traditional healers, some of these healers can be called pastors of lies as they never have any tangible evidence on many issues. I will sentence you to spend two years in a correctional facility if you fail to pay a fine of E2 000 for destroying the sofa and fridge, remember that you pleaded guilty to both the charges," she said.

The pioneers said they saw the need for Swazi citizens to have a platform that would enable them to express themselves on entertainment and sports issues.

The radio station, known as South Cast Radio, will be broadcasting from Limkokwing University.

This is where people from different backgrounds would air their views.

The station would also play music and help address issues that affect their daily lives.

Members of the public will be able to access the radio only through electronic applications which could be installed in cellphones, laptops, and other electronic gadgets.

The content of the radio would only

be heard once the application is open.

Without the application and internet connectivity, the radio content could not be accessed. This can prove to be a challenge because internet access in the

country is still expensive and is not accesible in all places.

During the launch, the students invit-

ed MTN Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Ambrose Dlamini to be part of the event. He was represented by MTN Corporate Communications Manager Mandla Luphondvo.

During the meeting, Luphondvo suggested that the pioneers of the radio station should approach the mobile telecommunications companies in the country to see how best they could address the challenge of the high costs of internet access. He said they could sit down with whatever company and see how it could be possible for the application to be zero rated.

This could help enhance easy access of the radio content for the people and that could in turn attract many advertisers to their radio station.

This could result in a situation where the station generates more income from many advertisers that would buy air space from the online radio station. Luphondvo mentioned that he was not promising them anything, but was only raising a suggestion.

Luphondvo's suggestion was enthusiastically accepted by the students, who showed that they wanted to implement his suggestion.

# VW Golf with local registration dumped in SA

THE VW Golf 5 GTI vehicle seems to be one of the most sought after models by criminals these days as yet another one has been discovered dumped at the Retail Crossing area in Roodepoort on Monday by the South African Police Services (SAPS).

The vehicle, which is suspected to have been stolen and used in criminal activities, was found abandoned with no occupants incide.

It's registration plates are; PSD 551BH.

Those who witnessed police inspecting the vehicle, shared its picture in one of the social network pages where information about hijacked and stolen cars in South Africa is shared.

Information gathered about the car is that it was left on the spot since Sunday morning and police only noticed it on Tuesday after realising that it had no owner.

Meanwhile, last week, Sibusiso Mavimbela, who goes by the stage name of DJ Yugo, had his Golf 5 stolen.

It was taken by two unmasked men on Tuesday evening. It is said the DJ was robbed at gunpoint as he was tied up and covered with a refuse bag before the criminals fled with the vehicle.

To date, the whereabouts of the car are unknown.

The news of the dumped Golf vehicle raised hopes that the numerous local cars that were stolen would be found in South Africa by the police.

However, the Golf which was found in Retail Crossing yesterday is not the one which was stolen from Yugo.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba said as police they had received news that a vehicle with Swazi registration plates was found abandoned in South Africa. However, Mamba said when they checked they discovered that the vehicle did not reflect in the system as the number plate is suspected to have been forged. Mamba said police are still working tirelessly to find the vehicle which was stolen from DJ Yugo last week.

#### Hindered

During the questions and answer session, one participant wanted to know where they stand (as women) because once they get married it is usually hard to be separated from their spouses, even if they want divorce.

She said this was because most of the time they were frustrated by Swazi culture and if they take the legal route, it usually takes forever for the matter to be finalised.

Speaking during the event, Simphiwe Dlamini from UGI advised women to not only get legal cover, but also health insurance too. Siphelele Mngomezulu from the Royal Swaziland Police Service said the

Drunk fined E1 000 for rushing pregnant wife to hospital

A man who was rushing his wife to hospital to give birth has been fined E1 000 for drinkdriving.

The arrest happened along the MR1 public road in Pigg's Peak on Sunday evening.

Appearing at the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court on Monday, Celucolo Nxumalo said on the night in question, he knew he was drunk but nobody was in the house to help him drive his wife to the hospital.

"I was forced to drive the car that night because my wife was in labour, and there was nobody else in the house who would help me drive her to hospital.

"So I took the risk of trying to drive my wife to the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital, unfortunately along the way, I was stopped by the police who then made me take a breathalyser test that I failed. I was then arrested but my wife was taken to the delivery room by the police,"

He pleaded for the court's leniency, adding that when he was nabbed for drink-driving, he was desperate to help his wife and his unborn baby. After a long deliberation, Pigg's Peak Magistrate Simangele Mbatha sentenced Nxumalo to five months in a correctional facility if he failed to pay a fine of E1 000 for driving under the influence of alcohol.

#### MULTISECTORAL **RESPONSE (MR)**

WE are now officially into the last quarter of the year 2017. In the HIV response, we have already seen various activities take place.

Of these, the highlight has been His Majesty King Mswati III's stellar address to the UN General Assembly (UNGA) side meeting on HIV/AIDS last month. His Majesty presented the success of the kingdom to reduce new infections and suppress viral load in people living with HIV, as attested by the Swaziland HIV Incidence Measurement Survey (SHIMS) 2.

His Majesty told the world of the Umgubudla (yes, said it in SiSwati) which is the roadmap for Ending AIDS in 2022 - eight years earlier than the global target for 2030.

Thanking those who supported the kingdom in the HIV response, His Majesty said, "The challenge is to keep the momentum (to reduce new infections, health for PLHIV and viral suppression), address complacency and sustain funding for treatment and reinvest in prevention". He presented that we cannot speak of ending AIDS without a directed focus on new infections, which have remained high among adolescents and young women.

As we navigate the last quarter of the year, there are many key activities that are still to take place in the HIV response, nationally and regionally. A few of these are:

#### The Fourth National Health Research Conference (NHRC)

The 4th NHRC is billed to take place on 8-10 November at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre in Ezulwini.The conference is expected to bring together about 600 delegates, including experts

in the field of health and related disciplines within and outside our borders to share scientific knowledge under the theme, 'Research-based evidence for improved policy, programming, and practice' for health.

The NHRC is a ministry of health led conference that is held every two years. It is a must-attend event for leaders, policy makers, change agents, health and development practitioners, scientists, researchers and members of the public who have interest in health issues.

**Efforts** Through the NHRC, the ministry of health strives to contribute to the country's development objectives as stated in the Swaziland Development Index Vision 2022' and National Development Strategy (NDS)

For its part, the NDS states that, "Research efforts should extend to all areas: natural sciences, production technology, social science, humanities and health." It explicitly states that there should be specific research programmes in all fields of major importance to help the country in meeting its developmental endeavours.

The 4th NHRC will offer, discuss and evaluate recent scientific developments and derive lessons to cooperatively contribute towards the achievement of Vision 2022.

Regular registration opened on September 1 and runs until October 31, and costs of E600, while onsite registration will be open from 6-9 November at E850.

Undergraduate students in tertiary institutions of learning have a special discounted rate of E300 (valid student ID card must be produced as proof), however, part-time and doctoral students will not benefit. International delegates will pay US\$100.

#### The 2017 ICASA

The International Conference on AIDS and Sexually Transmitted Infections in Africa (ICASA) is a major international African AIDS conference that takes place every second year. Its current biennial hosting alternates between Anglophone and Francophone African

countries. The 2017 ICASA will be in the context of strengthening the appliheld in Côte d'Ivoire at the Sofitel Abidjan Hotel Ivoire, Côte d'Ivoire, on the 4th - 9th December. ICASA is expected to convene over 10 000 delegates from nearly 150 countries, including 200 journal-

The conference is the premier gathering for those working in the field of HIV, as well as leaders, people living with HIV and others committed to ending the epidemic. ICASA 2017 coincides with the MDG target year, and it is offering the strategic first forum for post MGD to leaders, activists, scientists and community to take stock of the outcomes of the MDG High Level Meeting challenges and to pave the way for a new innovative and efficient approach towards an Africa AIDS-free generation. It will also provide an opportunity for researchers from around the world to share the latest scientific advances in the field, learn from one another's expertise, and develop strategies for advancing all facets of the collective

efforts to treat and prevent HIV Gathering in Sofitel Abidjan Hotel Ivoire, will therefore, work together to strengthen efforts across all regions and around the world, building on the momentum of recent scientific advances and the momentum from ICASA 2015.

World AIDS Day has taken place on December 1st every year since 1988

It provides an opportunity to draw attention to the HIV epidemic around the world. Many organisations and people organise events around the 1st December, to raise awareness on HIV; to remember loved ones who have died; to show solidarity with people living with HIV; to celebrate survival and health; and to raise money for HIV and related causes.

We have witnessed extra-ordinary progress since the turn of the millennium. The recently released figures from the Swaziland HIV Incidence Measurement Survey (SHIMS) 2, show significant reduction of incidence rates in some key age segments of the population. The most formidable obstacle remains that many people, especially young people, women, are getting newly infected with HIV, a sizeable people do not know their HIV status and some people living with HIV that are not accessing treatment or not adhering to their treatment regimens.

This year, the country will celebrate the increasing confidence that we will see the day when AIDS will no longer be the major public health challenge for Swaziland. We will celebrate the achievements made but also recognise the hard work that lies ahead, in particular the re-invigoration of HIV prevention and to reduce complacency as directed by our Leader. There is need to accelerate the pace of innovation, to end AIDS. The 2017 WAC / WAD is inspired by zero new infections goal andthe "90-90-90" global diagnosis and treatment targets -for improving the health of PLHIV and for reducing the virus to a point where it undetectable, making transmission of HIV to another person unlikely.

Preparations for the WAC / WAD have started in earnest and the roll out begins in November. To get to an AIDS-Free Swaziland, everybody counts. Individuals and organisations are urged to do their bit. #Play your part!



However, it might also include Paul Mashatile from Gauteng and Gwede Mantashe - both of whom are more aligned to Ramaphosa.

Of course for the Ramaphosa camp this alternative becomes acceptable if they realise that they are going to lose. For the Zuma camp the advantage would be the prevention of a split in the party - which is very likely if Dlamini-Zuma wins.

Although this looks like a good compromise, I am convinced that the third way as proposed at the moment is a win for the Zuma faction in camouflage. With Mabuza and other premier league leaders involved it cannot be anything else and is probably Zuma's plan B.

It was always obvious that a strategist like Zuma would never put all his (political) eggs in his ex-wife's basket. The question was just what his back-up plan would be. This could be it.

Support

The third way possibility will diminish Ramaphosa's chance of winning. If kingmaker Mabuza can secure the support of the Free State, North West, Mpumalanga, and Gauteng as well as the Mkhize and Zuma's support of KZN, it is game over for all the other candidates. If presented with such an alliance Ramaphosa would be

her deputy or she his. So President Zuma gets the dynamic leader in Mkhize and the figurehead and safety net of Dlamini-Zuma.

It is interesting that those supporting Ramaphosa are now pushing the narrative of tradition (that the deputy president always becomes president) in order to oppose the Zuma camp's narrative of unity, but it seems that the unity argument - albeit a rather dishonest one in this case - might win the day.

If this camouflaged Zuma-win actually materialises the ANC will without a doubt form a more united front and assuming President Zuma retires shortly after the conference, it will most likely ensure a comfortable majority for the ANC in 2019.

However, even though Mkhize is a different calibre of leader than most in the Zuma camp, the question remains how compromised he will be by those who secured his victory?

My guess is that he will not be

able to bring much reform or a different way of g o v erning, because he will be beholden to those who put h i m there. And

over the long run the ANC might win, but the coun-

try will lose. Some have argued that the proposed third way might be a cun-

ning plan between Ramaphosa and Mkhize. They argue that Mkhize would drop out at the end to support Ramaphosa with the promise of a senior Cabinet position - such as Finance Minister.

That would be a very high risk strategy.

It is important to remember that Mkhize (like all the other candidates) can stand for only one position in the top 6 (which might now become the top 9 or 10). So if he was to withdraw at the last minute he would be out of the office bearers' race and could at most be an additional NEC member.

So if Mkhize were to drop out at the end he would have to be pretty sure that Ramaphosa would win and also honour his word for a senior position in government.

The question remains that if Mkhize can secure a win for Ramaphosa by bringing in for example enough additional votes from KZN, why would Ramaphosa not put him on his slate from the start? Why risk this elaborate move?

In order to secure a Ramaphosa win Mkhize would most probably have to "deliver" Mabuza and it is very doubtful that Mabuza would agree to this - not without his premier league brothers-in-arms, such as Ace and Supra, also joining the slate.

It is also doubtful that Mkhize (who is clearly ambitious) would help Ramaphosa to be president if he could secure the top job for himself. So as much as we might want to believe otherwise, this is far more likely Zuma the ultimate strategist at work. - Melanie Verwoerd is a former ANC MP and South African Ambassador to Ireland.

TODAY I want us to look at a form of abuse that I would term 'A SERIAL KILLER', a form of abuse that is as bad as physical abuse.



### OSATU has a point, but the delivery is farcical

CAPE TOWN - It's been a while, but SA Rugby is having to deal with another threat by the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) to cause a scene on a Springbok match-day.

This happened in 2015 as well, when then-Bok coach Heyneke Meyer was under attack for his perceived questionable treatment of players of colour.

As it turns out, there was no matchday protest back then.

Hopefully, after discussions with SA Rugby take place today, there will be no match-day protest on Saturday either.

With Newlands expected to be packed and with the small matter of a 2023 Rugby World Cup bid pending, it is the last thing South African rugby needs.

The issue that COSATU has, however, is extremely pertinent, and it certainly deserves attention.

The trade union is challenging SA Rugby and SuperSport, demanding that Springbok Tests should be available to everybody and be broadcast free-to-air on SABC.

As it stands, only those who have subscriptions to DStv and SuperSport can watch Springbok matches live. It has been that way since forever, but that doesn't make it right.

SA Rugby, and South African sport in general, is under pressure to facilitate transformation and unearthing a pool of promising, young black talent is crucial.

It would make sense, then, that the whole country be allowed to our major sporting teams, regardless of their economic situation.

The majority of young, black sports fans currently have no exposure to Springbok rugby unless they are fortunate enough to have access to a DStv subscription.

It is not only rugby where this is an issue. When the Proteas play away from home, they are also not televised on SABC while Bafana Bafana have had their own welldocumented troubles when it comes to getting their matches on the public broadcaster.

In a perfect world, all of our major sporting codes would be available to everybody.

But the SABC, unfortunately, has problems that make it far from per-

support the Springboks, and all of fect and the reality is that broadcast deals are designed to make money. Cricket South Africa, SA Rugby,

the PSL, SAFA, SANZAAR ... they all benefit from their relationships with SuperSport.

And they do that because SuperSport has money to spend. SuperSport buys the rights and has the monopoly, the sporting body benefits from a cash injection and everybody wins. SABC, simply, isn't in the ball-

When one looks at their financial problems, it is easy to see why.

But that doesn't mean that COSATU's concerns are not valid. Springbok rugby ideally needs to be on SABC, and all parties concerned should be engaging in discourse to make that happen. News24

THE European Union (EU) has introduced radical liberalisation of the sugar market effective this week, with farmers free to grow as much as they want and refiners able to sell sugar globally after decades of strict output quotas and export limits.

Prior to the deregulation, a number of big economies disclosed their intention to significantly increase their production, ahead of the deregulation of the EU market.

For example, leading German sugar producers Suedzucker and Nordzucker said they plan to expand in the deregulated EU sugar market.

As a result, post the EU market deregulation, SSA embarked on a strategy to grow sales to both the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) and regional markets to prepare for the changes.

The association said SACU and regional markets, including the Southern African Development Community (SADC) and the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), were expected to provide better returns for Swazi sugar than the EU.

"Preferential access to these regional markets is necessary in order to ensure that Swazi sugar is competitive in these markets and that the prices attained are higher than those to be realised in the EU," said SSA.

The association said it has also worked very closely with government in targeting specific markets both to create and sustain preferences, where a dual line of communication was maintained, "and we are happy with the support we have been receiving from government thus far. More work will be directed at ensuring that these preferences continue and where possible are improved in the future, including through the Tripartite Free Trade Area (TFTA)."

Recently, the country signed and ratified the European Union - Southern African Development Community (SADC) Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA).

SSA said even though prices were anticipated to go down, the EU remains an important market for the country's sugar - both in terms of ability to absorb surplus volumes of sugar (not sold to the primary SACU and

regional markets) and to also provide a remunerative, preferential outlet for the country's sugar in cases where EU prices happen to pick up in the future.

"The EPA provides preferences for Swazi sugar, which will ensure that the commodity continues to receive better market access when exported to the EU market, as compared to sugar from non-EPA countries or less developed countries. SSA will maintain an open approach to supplying this market but the volume supplied would be dependent on the amount of surplus (on the one hand) and the expected returns (on the other)," said the association.

Another market opportunity was presented by the COMESA sugar safeguard, where the country was granted the highest allocation to sell over 60 000 tons of sugar per annum to the Kenyan market. This allocation would be reviewed after two

SSA said fulfilling the supply of the quota to Kenya remains an important target.

"We are working tirelessly to meet it. Maximum effort is being exerted to ensuring that Swaziland supplies a volume as close to the quota as possible," said the association.

#### 91 entities feed into govt's E10 billion procurement bill

THE Swaziland Public Procurement Regulatory Agency (SPPRA) has a mammoth task to work with 91 procuring entities that feed into the E10 billion bill by government and parastatals.

SPPRA Board Chairman Dr. Gideon Mahlalela said part of the board's responsibility is to safeguard against duplicate payments to the same suppliers, fictitious payments and overstated and inflated prices that edged above the value of actual service.

He also stressed that there was no need for the board to be in the committees for awarding tenders.

"The board has delegated authority to management and should abide by the 'Business Judgement Rule.' The rule assumes there is sufficient information for the board

to make decisions. The board needs to make sure through its various board committees there are checks and balances to make sure the right information reaches the board to make decisions," he said.

Dr. Mahlalela said the board represent sthe voice of the cus-

tomer, stakeholders and citizenry.

where today's decisions must address the needs of employees, the company and the future generations," he said.

#### 4th annual IPM convention aligns business leaders to digitised world

THE fourth annual Institute of People Management's (IPM) convention will provide a diagnosis for challenges of preparing for a digital future.

The convention themed 'Aligning Business Leaders to the Digitised World' will be held on October 11-12 at the Royal Swazi Sun Convention Centre in Ezulwini.

The institute said the theme was based on the realisation that many organisations were responding to the increasing demand for digitisation and operations integration with the aim to achieving operational efficiencies, better decision making and value chain management of the business.

"This assures businesses that its leaders have an overall sight of the business as opposed to silo-focus. This also speaks to organisations increasingly focusing on the need to innovate not only to ward off competition but also to assure operational efficiencies, employee engagement and future oriented organisational culture," said the institute.

However, the IPM said most executives have recognised that their companies were not adequately preparing for the industry disruptions that they expect to emerge from digital trends.

It said though nearly 90 per cent of respondents to the 2015 global survey of managers and executives conducted by MIT Sloan Management Review and Deloitte anticipated that their industries

would be disrupted by digital trends to a great or moderate extent, but only 44 per cent said their organisations were adequately preparing for the anticipated disruptions.

The IPM said the survey also established that most companies were constrained by lack of resources, talent, and the pull of other priorities, leaving executives to manage digital initiatives that either take the form of projects or are limited to activities within a given division, function, or channel

"It is anticipated that the conference will highlight the challenges of preparing for a digital future. It means developing dig-

ital capabilities in which a company's activities, people, culture, and structure are in sync and aligned toward a set of organisational goals," said the institute.

About 17 speakers have been lined up for the two days convention and these include guest speaker, Inviolata Chinyangarara and Federation of Swaziland Employers and Chamber of Commerce (FSE&CC) Chief Executive Officer Bonisiwe Ntando.

Chinyangarara is Senior Specialist for Workers Activities within the International Labour Organisation (ILO) Bureau for Workers Activities.

She is also part of the ILO Decent Work Team for eastern and southern Africa based in the ILO Pretoria office.

"This year's approach has been differentiated by the selection of diverse presentations on tracking of legislation changes as well as open discussions," said the IPM.

The topics will range from how organisations have leveraged technology to increase employee engagement, used digitisation as a catalyst for human capital growth, a benchmarked view of labour broking, the retirement crisis and potential solutions, the digital HR future its risks and opportunities, leadership accountability and change management as well as labour economics consideration in effective human capital management.

In addition to the aforementioned there will be two open discussions on leveraging technology for positive organisational culture as well as financial wellness and employee behaviour change.

# Exxaro is making chemistry with its Tronox shares

JOHANNESBURG - Exxaro shares strengthened 4 per cent on the JSE yesterday after the diversified mining company said it would sell 16 million shares in its New York-listed chemical business Tronox through a public offering.

Exxaro said it was selling the shares to focus on its core activities to provide funding for its future capital commitments, to repay debt and to return capital to its shareholders.

It said JPMorgan, Barclays and Morgan Stanley would act as joint book-running managers and underwriters for the offering.

"If today's offering is completed, Exxaro's ownership in Tronox would be reduced to approximately 29.4 percent, assuming no exercise of the underwriters' option to purchase additional shares," the company said in a statement.

Exxaro, one of the largest black-empow-



erment diversified firms in South Africa, owns 51million shares which represents a 43 per cent stake in the US-based titanium-dioxide producer.

The company said it planned to grant the underwriters a 30-day option to purchase up to 2.4million shares at the public offering price, less underwriting discounts and commissions. It also said that the offering was subject to market and other conditions.

"There can be no assurance as to whether or when the offering may be completed, or as to the actual size or terms of the offering," Exxaro said.

Cape Town-based Cadiz Corporate Solutions Director Peter Major described the proposed offering as good news for the company.

Major said while he had not yet seen

the details, the transaction would correct value destroyed by directors since Exxaro listed in late 2006.

"The whole Tronox saga was not good at all for the South African mineral sands assets put into it. Exxaro had no control over Tronox, nor the assets they placed into it," said Major.

"They don't control Kumba either - but at least it is well managed by long-experienced South Africans and pays good dividends. One has to ask oneself - what if Exxaro had just kept and managed the assets it originally had and paid out dividends from excess cash flow, instead of all the value destructive wheeling and dealing we saw these past 10 years? So sad! Where are all those directors now?"

The company in March flagged that it was exploring alternatives for monetisation of its shareholding in Tronox through an efficient staged sales approach in the second half of this year.

The company reportedly did not rule out returning a portion of the proceeds from the sale of its R11.82billion stake in Tronox to shareholders.

Exxaro Finance Director Riaan Kopperschaar said at the time that the company would consider distributing part of the proceeds from the sale to shareholder.

"Yes, we might. Everything will be in the pot. We will have to look at the (capital expenditure) programme, what money will be going to the (black economic empowerment) transaction. At the end of the day, it is about capital allocation."

Exxaro shares rose 4.99 per cent on the JSE yesterday to close at R131.85.

# GOVT VERY MINDFUL' OF INVESTORS, SAYS ZWANE

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's government is open to talks over the country's much-criticised Mining Charter but the industry must do more to benefit the black majority, Mineral Resources Minister Mosebenzi Zwane said.

The mining industry, represented by the Chamber of Mines, has rejected the government's new rules, saying extra levies and black-economic empowerment requirements threaten to curb the appeal of investing in projects. A judicial review of the legislation is scheduled to be held in December, in which Zwane must justify the new measures to a bench of judges. The charter, which was published in the Government Gazette in June, is "a living document that's the subject of the court," Zwane said in a speech in Johannesburg on Tuesday.

"As government and this department, our doors are always open to listen to the people of South Africa - business, labour, communities, investors. We are very mindful of the interest of investors in our country."

Though he's open to talks, Zwane said mining companies must not seek to do the job of government. "I listen, then I



go back and produce legislation," he said. "Don't help me to produce legislation. You are not legislation producers, you are business people."

Chief among the chamber's concerns is a rule requiring mines to be 30 per cent black-owned in perpetuity. That would lead to shareholder dilution because many companies already sold 26 per cent stakes to black investors at preferential rates in the 2000s to comply with previous rules, believing it was a one-time deal, detractors say.

Other concerns include a 1 per cent levy on revenue that must be paid black investors before other shareholder dividends, and increased local procurement targets.

"We recognise the contribution" that the industry has made to improving the lives of black South Africans after the country ended white-minority rule in 1994, Zwane said.

"Is it enough? I'm sure we'll agree a lot more needs to be done."

# Weak rand takes a dollar hammering

JOHANNESBURG - The resurgent dollar yesterday saw the rand continue its downward trend with the demand for the local currency dampened by disappointing data which showed a R13billion budget deficit for August, spiking fears that further credit downgrades were looming.

The local unit weakened nearly a per cent against the greenback and was bid at R13.6842 as it struggled to find its footing amid deteriorating sentiment. In intra-day trade, the rand reached a more than five months low of R13.76 against the dollar. The slumber of the rand follows negative sentiment that emerging market currencies were expected to suffer in a climate of renewed dollar strength. Investec analysts said that outflows from bonds had been particularly impactful.

"The problem for South Africa is that it remains one of the standout recipients of hot money flows, which render it vulnerable to a turn in sentiment either local or abroad. At the moment it is a combination of both, which makes it difficult for the rand to withstand the poor sentiment and it has weakened," Investec said. "Although the domestic funda-

mentals continue to suggest that the rand has yet to reach its terminal inflection point, there is no question that political developments have detracted from the overall performance of the local unit and will likely continue doing so to the end of the year."

The Institute of International Finance report on capital flows to emerging markets yesterday said that prospects for capital flows in South Africa going forward hinged on both global market conditions and local developments. Last week the rand opened at R13.33 to the dollar, and then weakened to R13.63 on the back of increased prospects of a future US interest rate hike.

The dollar rose by a per cent last week, its best week of the year. The US Federal Reserve Bank's Federal Open Market Committee, which set US interest rates last week, sprung a surprise in its September policy meeting when it left the rate unchanged against the market expectation of a balance sheet reduction programme. The committee instead took a surprising hawkish monetary tone and indicated confidence in the US economy, signalling the possibility of another rate hike before the end of 2017 - and three more hikes in 2018. - Business Report

The applicant who brought the case was assigned female at birth, but self-identifies as a man. The court found that by refusing to change the man's gender on his identity document, Botswana's Registrar of National Registration had violated several of his basic human rights. AllAfrica


# SA, ZIM MUST WORK TOGETHER TO FIGHT CYBER ATTACKS - MUGABE

PRETORIA - Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe has urged his country and South Africa to stand together to protect their economies against cyber attacks.

During his opening remarks at the annual Bi-National Commission between South Africa and Zimbabwe held in Pretoria, Mugabe said cyber attacks were being used as a means to undermine the economies of the two countries and that this should be guarded against.

"I think together we should protect our economies from those trying to destroy them," said Mugabe.

Zimbabwean Minister of Defence Sydney Sekeramayi said at the forefront of the cyber attacks were the British. "Regime change is an agen-



da that is being pursued very vigorously by the British," said Sekeramayi.

"They have always been fighting

against ZANU-PF."

Sekeramayi said cyber attacks were a global problem being suffered by countries including China, the US and Russia.

"So you get a situation where every country is taking the necessary precautionary measures so that they are able to identify where cyber attacks are originating from and what measures can be taken to neutralise them."

"So as Zimbabwe we are also in the process of now building that machinery that is able to identify and neutralise those attacks."

He added that while the biggest threat to the Zimbabwean economy, recently, has been sanctions and companies and investors leaving because of the countries land reform programme, the economy was now under threat because of cyber attacks. *AFP* 

# #TAJAMUKA SPOKESPERSON QUITS AFTER EMBEZZLEMENT CLAIMS

HARARE – Zimbabwean Tajamuka/Sesijikile lobby group spokesperson Promise Mkwananzi quit following allegations of donor fund embezzlement, the group confirmed on Monday.

The Tajamuka/Sesijikile pressure group has been lobbying for President Robert Mugabe to be ousted.

"We want to inform stock-holders of the campaign and all progressive activists that Promise Mkwananzi voluntarily decided to temporarily recuse himself from the task as #Tajamuka/Sesjikile campaign spokesperson to allow allegations levelled against him to be investigated," a statement by the pressure group read.

"However, he will continue to participate in campaigns activities.

We welcome this noble decision that detaches the young peoples' campaign from potential jeopardy. We applaud Mkwananzi for leading by example."

The pressure group spokesperson stood accused of misappropriating funds meant for their activities.

He was said to have personalised a Subaru vehicle, which was reportedly donated for their activities as well. Tajamuka said they would soon probe the allegations.

"A five-member committee (comprising three women) chaired by a legal practitioner will be set within five days to allow Mkwananzi to answer to the allegations," the grouping said.

"The report shall be tabled before the general meeting."

Mkwananzi confirmed stepping down, saying: "Following serious allegations being levelled against me by Fadziso Doyce nee Jena, I am temporarily recusing myself from the position of Tajamuka spokesperson to save the movement from my personal troubles and to take time to clear my name and allow my colleagues to take a look at the allegations.

"I will continue to serve and participate in Tajamuka activities, but no longer in the capacity of its spokesperson."

#### Boris Johnson under fire for 'dead bodies' Libya gaffe

MANCHESTER - British Foreign Minister Boris Johnson came under fire on Tuesday for saying Libya could become a magnet for tourists and investors - if it can "clear the dead bodies away" first.

Reflecting on his August visit to Libya, strife-torn since a war and the eventual toppling of longtime dictator Muammar Gaddafi in 2011, Johnson said British businesses wanted to invest in the city of Sirte.

"They have got a brilliant vision to turn Sirte into the next Dubai," he told Conservatives attending the party's annual conference in Manchester, talking up its "bone-white sands, beautiful sea" and "brilliant young people".

"The only thing they have got to do is clear the dead bodies away," he added, before laughing. Johnson's political career has been characterised by outspoken comments and personal controversy, which have won voters unbelievably crass and insensitivom the European Union. *AFP* 

#### Rwanda charges president's critic with insurrection

KIGALI - Rwandan prosecutors said on Tuesday that a prominent critic of President Paul Kagame had been charged with inciting insurrection against the state as well as other offences.

Provisional detention was requested for Diane Rwigara, who was blocked from challenging Kagame in August's presidential election, as well as for her mother Adeline Rwigara and her sister Anne Rwigara.

"The charges include forgery of

documents and signature counterfeiting by Diane, sectarian practices by Adeline Rwigara and inciting insurrection for all the three," a spokesman for the state prosecutor's office, Faustin Nkusi, told AFP.

Diane Rwigara has said they were questioned by police almost daily in the first three weeks of last month, before being detained for questioning on September 22.

There was no mention of allegations of tax evasion, which had been raised previously.

In an interview with AFP just before her detention last month, Rwigara said she was a victim of political persecution "for standing against oppression and speaking my mind."

Other critics and opposition figures have also been detained in recent weeks in what observers say is a post-election crackdown on dissent.

# Hawks anti-corruption commander arrested for theft

MBOMBELA - An anti-corruption commander has been suspended amid allegations that he stole over R400 000 cash from different suspects during operations, the Hawks said on Wednesday.

Captain Richard Nkwanyana, 48, handed himself over in Middelburg on Monday, October 2, after a protracted investigation, said Brigadier Hangwani Mulaudzi.

The National Intervention Unit, which was deployed to Mpumalanga in May 2016, apparently seized two cash amounts from two different suspects.

Both cases, involving cash amounts of R232 400 and R164 500, were transferred to the Hawks for further investigation.

"There was no evidence which linked both suspects to the suspected cash seizures. The two alleged suspects sought the intervention of private lawyers to retrieve their cash and these were granted by the Nelspruit Magistrate Court."

It transpired that the money had apparently vanished.

Nkwanyana, who took responsibility to safeguard the cash, gave different statements.

After an investigation in Mpumalanga, it emerged that a further R43 000 was also said to be missing from a total of R118 800 cash seized from a suspect, that was supposed to be forfeited to the State. Nkwanyana appeared briefly in the Nelspruit Magistrate's Court this week on charges of theft and defeating the ends of justice. He was released on R5 000 bail and barred from entering any Hawks offices.

He was expected in court again on

October 17.

Acting Hawks head, Lieutenant-General Yolisa Matakata warned that unethical actions of a few members would not be tolerated. She said the presence of corruption was "like a cancer eating out the very heart" of the Hawks.

"The fight against corruption must be fulsome, total and unrelenting and hence I have ordered that the member be suspended immediately."

#### MK vets call all-inclusive conference

JOHANNESBURG - The ANC has attracted "opportunists and careerists" into its ranks.

Members see their membership as a means to advance personal ambition to attain power and access to resources.

This is contained in a discussion document to be presented by former UmKhonto we Sizwe (MK) combatants at an all-inclusive conference in Nasrec, Soweto, this weekend.

The former combatants, who include General Siphiwe Nyanda and Deputy Minister of Justice and Correctional Services Thabang Makwetla, are challenging the legitimacy of the UmKhonto we Sizwe Military Veterans Association (MKMVA) conference which saw Kebby Maphatsoe - one of President Jacob Zuma's allies - re-elected the association's leader in June.

That conference discussed the ANC's policy documents and how to empower ordinary people economically.

"The opportunists and careerists joined the ANC not because they believed in its policies and upheld its values, but because it created the possibility to access positions of state power," the document says.

"These positions would then be

abused for self-enrichment and otherwise to promote the interests of opportunists and careerists, against the interests of the ordinary working people."

The report cites careerism as one of the negative features that have emerged within the ANC in the past three years.

"In reality, during the last three years, we have found it difficult to deal with such careerists in a decisive manner.

"We have also seen the emergence of elitism among some of our members." The former MK combatants argue that there is also the emergence of the use of lies and fabrications by members of the ANC to promote their political objectives.

"This goes together with the regular practice of leaks to the media in an effort to create a public climate favourable to the interests of those who use misinformation as their organisational tool."

The document is proposing urgent action against ANC leaders, members and public officials who are facing damaging allegations of improper conduct. The document also points out that the scramble for positions in the state machinery has encouraged indiscipline in the ANC. SowetanLive

Another organiser, Nthabiseng Moeketsi said the believers gathered in Pretoria because of the love of their country deeply.

"This is an initiative organised by women. We are telling the Lord that women are being raped, there are drugs, there is child abuse, and shootings happening at schools. Here is a nation in trouble, and we are asking for the Lord to intervene and help us. We are going to continue to pray about this in our provinces, in our homes. This gathering today has kicked off a prayer movement," she said.

# AUTONOMOUS TWO-SEATER PASSENGER DRONE COMPLETES FIRST MANNED FLIGHT

CALIFORNIA - Passenger Drone can be piloted manually or passengers can simply select their destination, sit back and relax, as the drone takes control.

Flight testing of the vertical take off and landing (VTOL) craft began in early May and for the last few months it has undergone intensive assessments.

Experts at the company, based in California, used different simulated payload weights, engine failures and control modes, before field testing began.

It was then put through its paces without a pilot onboard and, following successful testing, in August 2017 the first manned flights took place.

Footage of the first flight, which was around two to three miles (roughly four km), was released this week as part of the product's official launch.

In a written statement, a company spokesman said: "On-demand aviation and manned drones has the potential to radically transform how we get from place to place, and to restore precious lost family and personal time to commuters worldwide.

"Overall, the lower cost and improved flexibility provided by aerial drone technology may afford compelling solutions for individuals, businesses or governments worldwide.

"Passenger Drone is excited and passionate about the potential benefits, and

positive impact VTOL urban air transportation can offer."

Equipped with 16 electric engines, the firms says Passenger Drone is a low-noise, high-speed, and economical mean of transportation with zero emissions.

Its engine system is less complex than most quad-copters, which the firm says provides enhanced safety, performance, greater payload and range.

It also claims it produces less noise than other models already available on the marketplace.

The vehicle's structure is composed of lightweight and strong carbon fibre composites, especially created for Passenger Drone.

The avionics, stability systems and electrical control systems have been custom designed, especially for the company.

Passenger Drone's internal communications are transmitted through fibre optics.

With the exception of the main power cables, there are no other wires in the entire aircraft.

From the connection between the control joystick, main control CPU, engine controllers and the navigation screens, everything is communicated by light.

This is designed to ensure the safety, reliability, and security of the drone.

The 16 individual rotors are all powered separately to enhance stability, cohesion, and redundancy

Its creators believe that social and economic benefits of such a vehicle are numerous.

In cities around the world, traffic congestion costs commuters millions of hours every year and billions in lost productivity.

The average travel time to work in the United States is 25.4 minutes, representing almost an hour every day, and just under two weeks annually.

Congestion

In 2016, the total cost of congestion to all drivers in the US was £226 billion (\$300 billion) including environmental costs, according to Passenger Drone.

That total is expected to rise by 50 per cent over the next 15 years.

In many global megacities, the situation is far worse.

# Macron fights 'president of the rich' tag after ending wealth tax

PARIS - President Emmanuel Macron fought off accusations of favouring the rich on Tuesday after making good on a campaign pledge to scrap France's wealth tax - a symbol of social justice that has scared off thousands of millionaires from French shores.

Macron's move to replace the tax with a levy targeting only real estate in last week's 2018 budget was used by political opponents to brand him the "president of the rich", a label the ex-Rothschild banker has been struggling to shake off since taking office in May.

In a visit to a Whirlpool factory in his native town of Amiens, scene of a showdown six months ago with his then far-right challenger Marine Le Pen in the presidential election contest, Macron defended the policy.

"It's all well and good to want to spread the wealth, but you first need to produce, to create wealth before redistributing, that's how it works," he told journalists.

After many European countries abolished their own, France was left as the only EU member with a wealth tax, a charge introduced by the Socialists in the 1980s which were levied on individuals with assets above 1.3 million euros (R20.52 million).

That led to thousands of rich French families to move to countries such as Belgium to avoid paying the tax, including most famously 'Green Card' actor Gerard Depardieu and members of the Mulliez family, owners of the Auchan supermarket chain.

Prime Minister Edouard Philippe has estimated some 10 000 people with 35 billion euros worth of assets left in the past 15 years.

But coming after the government's decision to cut a housing allowance enjoyed by millions of poorer French people, the move on the wealth tax - which will cost the treasury 3.2 billion euros in lost revenue - has sparked outrage in opposition ranks.

#### BRAZIL COPS BUST TUNNEL INTENDED FOR \$317M BANK HEIST

SAO PAULO - Brazilian police say they have foiled a bank heist plot in which would-be robbers dug a 500m tunnel to a Sao Paulo branch of government-owned Banco do Brazil.

The Sao Paulo state Public Safety Department said on Tuesday in a statement that agents had been monitoring the gang for three months but only discovered the tunnel on Monday.

By then the tunnel was complete. But police arrested 16 suspects before they could pull off the heist.

They allegedly told officers they had hoped to steal the equivalent of \$317m.

Investigator Fabio Pinheiro Lopes said the gang spent \$1.27m to build the tunnel from a rented home nearby.

Twelve years ago, a different gang tunneled into a bank vault in Fortaleza and made away with \$70m in Brazilian reals.

# TRUMP PRAISES PUERTO RICAN, US OFFICIALS

SAN JUAN - US President Donald Trump has praised Puerto Rican and US officials for their efforts in dealing with the damage caused by Hurricane Maria.

Trump is on a mission to reassure residents their well-being matters to him.

San Juan's Mayor, Carmen Yulin Cruz has repeatedly accused Trump of showing insufficient concern for the US territory.

In response, Trump took to Twitter a few days ago to criticise Cruz's poor leadership skills.

While he shook hands with Cruz on arrival, he was full of praise for local and federal authorities.

"We've saved a lot of lives every death is a horror- but if you look at a real catastrophe like Katrina and you look at the

# US EXPELS 15 CUBAN DIPLOMATS FOLLOWING MYSTERIOUS ATTACKS

WASHINGTON - The United States ordered the expulsion of 15 Cuban diplomats on Tuesday, accusing Havana of failing to protect their American counterparts from harm in a series of attacks on their health.

Secretary of State Rex Tillerson said, however, that Washington would maintain diplomatic relations even though the size of the US mission in Havana would be reduced to a minimum. "Until the government of Cuba can ensure the safety of our diplomats in Cuba, our embassy will be reduced to emergency personnel to minimise the number of diplomats at risk of exposure to harm," he said.

"This order will ensure equity in our respective diplomatic operations," he said.

Cuba's Foreign Minister Bruno

Rodriguez Parrilla said he would protest the order – which he branded "unjustified... unfounded and unacceptable" –- but did not immediately threaten further tit-for-tat action.

"By these politically motivated and thoughtless actions, the US government is responsible for the current and possibly future deterioration of bilateral relations," he said.

#### **US admin backs Tillerson's effort**

WASHINGTON - Pentagon chief Jim Mattis tried to clear up doubts about the US administration's North Korea strategy on Tuesday, backing Secretary of State Rex Tillerson's effort to find a diplomatic solution to the nuclear stand-off. Defence Secretary Mattis was speaking two days after President Donald Trump appeared to undermine his top diplomat by saying Tillerson was "wasting his time" by maintaining contacts with Kim Jong-Un's regime. State Department officials insist Trump was not criticizing Tillerson, but pressuring Kim Jong-Un's regime to agree to discuss its disarmament while a diplomatic option remains on the table. AFP

EAST STROUDSBURG - A Pennsylvania funeral director already facing charges of taking photos with corpses to gross out her friends and relatives is facing new charges of evidence tampering. The Monroe County district attorney's office alleges Angeliegha (anjah-LEE'-ah) Stewart deleted four images from her Google photos account during an ongoing investigation. Prosecutors say two of the photos were selfies with bodies in the background and two were of the faces of dead people. Stewart previously was charged with abuse of a corpse and marijuana possession. A nine-year-old westem New York girl who broke her ankle after falling through an open manhole into the sewer 12 feet below yelled for help for an hour before a passer-by heard her. Captain Daniel



O'Leary of the Buffalo Fire Department tells WKBW-TV the girl was trapped in a foot of rushing water after falling through the open hole while walking to school in Buffalo around 07:30 on Tuesday. He says crews lowered a ladder, and she was able to climb out. It's unknown why the hole was not covered. A spokesperson for the city says crews weren't doing sewer work in the area.

#### Mother accused of killing daughter

GLENWOOD — A southwestern Iowa mother accused of giving her eight-year-old daughter fatal amounts of an antidepressant drug is set to stand trial in December. Mills County court records say 34-year-old Misty Frazier, has pleaded not guilty to second-degree murder, child endangerment and giving prescription drugs to a minor without a prescription. 



This amount, the youngster managed to pay and that kicked off the recording processes but down the road, Thasa then again sang a different tune; giving the youngster another bill for studio time.

#### Deal

This new E700 bill did not go down well with the youngster as they had not discussed it prior to the recording, which then made him (Jay Follen) want out of the deal, taking with him the song.

"When I approached Sishwashwa for my track, he told me to pay E550 for mastering the track which was not something we agreed upon," he said.

Tiyas found out what had happened, he gave me the share he got from the vocals which was E1 000 however, Sishwashwa has been avoiding my



and seek, as up to now he still has not given me my balance."

Equally humbling, according to him, is the support he has been receiving from the SA audience that seemingly cannot have enough of him.


His hit track 'Gelekece' has elevated his profile and music in ways he cannot describe, he says.



#### Returning home helped City's Johannes find form


CAPE TOWN - Robyn Johannes has discovered, to his joy and advantage, that the old idiom 'east or west, home is best' contains more than a kernel of truth.

# RGENTINA HOPES ON LINE IN PERU CLASH

ARGENTINA - Argentina's stumbling 2018 World Cup qualification campaign faces another awkward hurdle today as the misfiring South American giants take on in-form Peru in Buenos Aires.

The 2014 World Cup finalists have lurched from one disappointment to the next since South America's qualifiers kicked off two years ago, with the twotime champions invariably failing to add up to the sum of their talented parts. Despite a formidable arsenal of attackers led by Lionel Messi, the Argentinians have scored just 16 goals in 16 games, the second lowest total behind alreadyeliminated Bolivia.

A lacklustre 1-1 home draw with Venezuela in their last outing on 5 September left Argentina's hopes of automatic qualification for next year's finals in Russia hanging by the slenderest of threads.

#### Final

With just today's game against Peru and next week's challenging trip to Ecuador remaining, Argentina are in fifth place in the table, outside the top four automatic qualifying places.

While a fifth-place finish would likely still see them qualify for Russia - with what ought to be a straightforward playoff assignment against New Zealand awaiting - a crowded table means Argentina can't take anything for grant-

If South American champions Chile currently in sixth place, one point adrift of Argentina - win their home match against Ecuador, and fourth-placed Peru win or draw in Buenos Aires, Argentina will head into the final round of games next week outside both the automatic qualifying and playoff places.

In a bid to avoid that scenario, Argentina

have sought to obtain every advantage possible against Peru, who have reignited their qualification campaign with consecutive wins over Uruguay, Bolivia and Ecuador.

The match has been moved to Boca Juniors' intimidating La Bombonera ground, where steep stands surrounding three sides of the pitch help to create a bearpit-like atmosphere in the 49 000-capacity venue.

#### Venue

Peru last month requested to FIFA that the game be moved to another venue on safety grounds. A 2015 Copa Libertadores match at the ground was suspended when River Plate players were assaulted with a sub-

Ironically, however, the choice of venue may be a good omen for Peru. The Peruvians secured a famous 2-2 draw at La Bombonera in 1969 which saw them qualify for the 1970 World Cup at the expense of Argentina. It was the last occasion Argentina

failed to qualify for the World Cup. Whether the move to La Bombonera is able to provide spark the Argentina have

lacked so far remains to be seen. Under new coach Jorge Sampaoli - their third of the qualification campaign - Argentina drew their last two matches against Uruguay and Venezuela.

Mario Kempes, one of the stars of Argentina's 1978 World Cup triumph, gave voice to the exasperation of many fans struggling to understand why a squad boasting the likes of Messi, Paulo Dybala, Mauro Icardi and Angel Di Maria has failed to fire.

"When they pull the Argentina shirt on, it's like they suddenly forget how to play football," a bemused Kempes said in a recent interview.

Chasing a first World Cup finals

they are ready for the challenge. "We are fully prepared for this, we are a team that is capable of beating anyone," said their Argentinian coach Ricardo Gareca.

#### PLAYOFF LOOMS FOR EDGY ITALY

Barring major surprises, Italy will finish as Group G runners-up behind Spain and will have to face the uncertainties of the perilous playoff round - a prospect that has fans and media on edge. Italian federation President Carlo Tavecchio has described the possibility of the four-time champions not qualifying as "the Apocalypse."

He even suggested FIFA should change the rules in the future so that a team's past record is taken into account during the qualifiers - though he did not elaborate on how this would work.

"It's not right that they don't take into account the four world titles; it goes against history," he said. Barring the inaugural World Cup in 1930, which they did not enter, Italy have appeared at every tournament except in 1958 when they were squeezed out by Northern Ireland.

#### **ICELAND'S EURO 2016 PERFORMANCE NO FLUKE**

Iceland's displays in Group I have dispelled any suggestions that their run to the Euro 2016 quarterfinals was a fluke.

They go into the final two rounds of matches level on 16 points with leaders Croatia and with an excellent chance of making at least the playoffs.

Under Heimir Hallgrimsson, who

was joint coach alongside Lars Lagerback two years ago and is now in sole charge, Iceland, have a 100 per cent home record with wins over Finland, Turkey, Croatia and Ukraine.

After a crucial visit to third-placed Turkey (14 points) tomorrow, they host bottom side Kosovo three days later.

#### NETHERLANDS ON THE BRINK

Italy's problems are minor compared to Netherlands who must win away to Belarus on Saturday and then beat Sweden at home, probably by several goals, next Tuesday to have a realistic chance of finishing second in Group A and making the playoffs.

Their campaign, featuring homeand-away defeats by France and a loss in Bulgaria, has already cost coach Danny Blind his job, with the reins being handed to old favourite Dick Advocaat recalled for a third stint in charge at the age of 70.

#### PORTUGAL, SWITZERLAND SET FOR LISBON SHOWDOWN

Switzerland kicked off Group B with a shock 2-0 home win against a groggy Portugal who had barely recovered from their Euro 2016 triumph two months earlier and were missing Cristiano Ronaldo through an injury sustained in that tournament.

Both teams have won all their matches since then, leaving the Swiss top with 24 points from eight games and Portugal second on 21, helped by 14 goals in seven outings from Ronaldo.

If Switzerland beat visiting Hungary on Saturday and Portugal win in Andorra that will set up a showdown in Lisbon on October 10 where the European champions, who have a far superior goal difference, could snatch top spot by beating the Swiss.

#### **BIG NIGHT FOR MONTENEGRO**

Tiny Montenegro face one of the biggest matches in their short history when they host Denmark today. The teams, second and third respectively in Group E, are level on 16 points, three behind leaders Poland.

Montenegro, led by Sevilla midfielder Stevan Jovetic and Atletico Madrid's Stefan Savic, are bidding to qualify for their first major tournament since independence in 2006. Montenegro, with a population of only 650 000, beat Denmark away and, with a tough visit to Poland in their last match, would ideally need to beat the Danes again to stay on course.

#### **GLIMMER OF HOPE FOR SCOTLAND**

Victory over Slovenia at Wembley will give England a place at next year's World Cup in Russia and with Kane scoring goals so freely, his teammates will take to the field buoyed by an extra measure of belief.

"He is hot, isn't he?" goalkeeper Joe Hart said to journalists at England's St George's Park base earlier this week.

"He is scoring just as many goals as the people we have related to as worldclass and he has been doing it for many

seasons. Harry gets put in that bracket and deserves to be.

"He has (Mauricio) Pochettino, one of the hottest managers in the world, who regards him highly and there are reasons for that.

"Harry is just brilliant at what he does and he is just one of the best out

there. He keeps scoring goals and you cannot ask for any more than that. Long may it continue in an England shirt."

Since Kane returned to the international fold at the end of last season following a spate of injuries, his goals have helped to keep Gareth Southgate's England side on course for qualification.

His 93rd-minute equaliser prevented England from falling to a first defeat against Scotland since 1999 in

MADRID - Cristiano Ronaldo isn't recognised for his generosity on the pitch but the Real Madrid star makes up for it in his charity work after selling off a prized Ballon d'Or trophy to raise over £530,000.

The Real Madrid star donated a replica of his 2013 award to a London auction at the weekend which was snapped up by Idan Ofer, Israel's richest person, for €600,000, according to Spanish daily Marca.

Ronaldo specifically asked for the replica of his 2013 award to be donated to the charity auction, raising funds for a UK charity.

The funds will go towards the Make-A-Wish Foundation, a charity that grants wishes for children with life-threatening medical conditions or who are terminally ill.

Pep Guardiola and Jose Mourinho also contributed to the event with €30,000 (£27 000) being paid to watch a boxing match in Manchester, which included a meet and greet with the respective City and United managers.

The Ballon d'Or trophy is recognised as one of the highest personal accolades a player can receive in the game. Under

Ronaldo has been gearing up with Portugal ahead of two crucial World Cup qualifiers, where his side take on Andorra on Saturday before facing Group B leaders Switzerland in their final game next week.

#### Leicester registration appeal rejected

LEICESTER - Leicester's appeal to register Adrien Silva has been rejected by FIFA.

The Foxes and the Football Association had asked FIFA to ratify the midfielder's transfer after the paperwork for the £22million deadline day move from Sporting Lisbon was submitted 14 seconds late.

But it has been denied and Silva will now not be registered to play for Leicester until January.

It means FIFA will continue to withhold the International Transfer Certificate (ITC) for the Portugal international midfielder.

In the meantime, Silva is not legally allowed to even train with the rest of the Leicester squad. Instead, Silva has been training alone rather than with the rest of Craig Shakespeare's first team as the wrangle has dragged on.

The 28-year-old recently flew back to his homeland to be with his pregnant wife, and Shakespeare admits that the player's professional concerns lies with not just Leicester but his place in the national team too.

'The conversations I've had with him so far are very brief. But of course in the back of his mind the World Cup will be a concern,' Shakespeare said recently.

'But I think he is more interested in finding the right solution for here and now.'

#### Ruthless Halep ousts Sharapova from China Open

BEIJING - Maria Sharapova was emphatically dumped out of the China Open in the third round yesterday by Simona Halep, going down 6-2, 6-2 to Romania's world number two.

The Russian, a former number one now languishing at 104 in the world rankings, is still searching for her first title since returning in April from a 15-month suspension for taking the banned substance meldonium.

Sharapova, 30, struggled all week with her serve and she made a night-mare start as she lost the opening game to love, before breaking Halep back

With world number one Garbine Muguruza exiting in the first round with a virus, the 26-year-old Halep is now favourite in the Chinese capital.

Despite stretching his Formula One world championship lead over Ferrari rival Sebastian Vettel to 34 points with five races left, Hamilton took a swipe at his Mercedes team.

"There are some real big problems that I can't really explain to you," he said. "There is stuff that has been happening through the weekend that is not acceptable for this great team."

Hamilton came into last year's Suzuka race in a foul mood and seeking solace after raising the possibility of a Mercedes conspiracy against him following an engine fire in Malaysia.

But the Briton triggered further controversy when he was criticised for posting photos on social media during a press conference.

Furious with tabloids for labelling him "snap prat" and the "berc in the Merc", Hamilton sulkily refused to answer questions after qualifying in Suzuka as the row rumbled on.

Hamilton, a three-time winner in Japan, will be hoping for a better

performance from his car this week than in Malaysia.

"Every point counts," said Mercedes team principal Toto Wolff.
"We got lucky again (in Malaysia)

"We got lucky again (in Malaysia) and we expect a very close fight between ourselves, Ferrari and Red Bull at Suzuka."

Hamilton, who has 281 points to Vettel's 247, had warned Ferrari would push Mercedes hard in Malaysia.

But they dodged a bullet as Vettel finished fourth after starting from the back of the grid, while Kimi Raikkonen suffered a calamitous engine failure that knocked him out of the race.

Hamilton snatched the title lead from Vettel at Monza last month but Mercedes, who have dominated the sport in recent years, face a growing threat from Ferrari and Red Bull.

Verstappen capped a fairytale 20th birthday weekend in Malaysia with his second Formula One victory, as Australian team-mate Daniel Ricciardo took third.

But with Valtteri Bottas finishing fifth, Mercedes will need to find some extra speed at Suzuka, where Nico Rosberg's 2016 victory completed a hat-trick of wins for the Silver Arrows in Japan.

Verstappen's sizzling performance in Malaysia suggests he may have turned the corner after retiring from seven of the first 15 races this season.

#### Kyrgios enjoys 'redemption' for Shanghai meltdown

BEIJING, China - Nick Kyrgios said he wanted to make up for his notorious meltdown last year in Shanghai as he beat Mischa Zverev in the second round of the China Open yesterday.


A year ago the supremely talented but combustible Kyrgios was suspended for his petulant behaviour at the Shanghai Masters, where he swore and argued with the crowd and appeared to give away points in caving in to the German.

The enigmatic Australian, seeded eighth on Beijing's outdoor hard courts this year, smashed his racquet on the floor in anger, bending the head in half, when he conceded the opening set yesterday.

That earned the world number 19 a warning from the umpire and raised the spectre of one year ago. But the 22-year-old returned for the second set with renewed determination and errors began creeping into Zverev's game.

Zverey, ranked 27 in the world and the older brother of rising star Alexander, surrendered his first service game of the second set and Kyrgios was never in trouble after that, surging into the next round 3-6, 6-2, 6-2.

During one changeover the Australian





SOCCER-DEPUTY Senate President Ngomuyayona Gamedze has defended under fire national team Sihlangu coach Pieter De Jongh.

Gamedze said it was unfortunate that the coach was being crucified for the country's dwindling status in the international FIFA rankings when he was not to blame.

He said the rankings saw the squad going down not because of the coach but due to inactivity for some time.

"De Jongh came at a bad time and it is unfortunate he is being blamed for the rankings when it is not his fault. We will go down further in terms of rankings and there are a number of challenges associated with this," he said.

#### Blame

The deputy president, however, stated that part of the blame could be shifted to the Netherlands-born coach as nothing had changed since he arrived in the country.

"We cannot offer a person a one-year contract with the requirement being that he takes us to CAF. Our contracts should have exit clauses so that when a person fails to perform they leave instead of relying on a non-performing official," he said.

He then urged the Senate chamber to support the ministry of sports, culture and youth affairs, which he said was working hard despite the challenges they

"This ministry gets the least budget but they are doing a great job. They need our assistance and deserve a respectable budget considering that the sports are a vehicle to 2022

#### Perform

The issue of the coach was raised by Senator Lungile Gama, who wanted to know why the national team was now failing to perform.

"Learning that our national team would be playing was great news but things are different now. I would also like to know the issue of the assistant coach as it was discussed," she said.

The senators had urged the minister to table a report on the non-performance of the team as well as appointing former head coach Harries 'Madze' Bulunga as the team's assistant coach.

In response, the minister said they were still working on the report and that it would also be tabled before the House. Meanwhile, Senator Menjeni Mahlalela urged government to consider all the money allocated to Sihlangu on time.

"We always hear of millions being allocated to Sihlangu. Does the team receive this money on time as this would allow it to be able to do all that is needed for them to perform," he said.

# SENATORS BLAST 14-TEAMLEAGUE

SOCCER - THE issue of the 14-team league has not gone down well with some senators, who feel there was lack of integrity in the way the matter was handled.

The matter was discussed during the Parliament Portfolio Committee on Sports sitting yesterday. The senators wanted to know from Minister of Sports, Culture and Youth Affairs David 'Cruiser' Ngcamphalala how the issue of 14 teams came about.

First to raise the issue was Senator Sibusiso Shongwe, who asked if there was integrity in dealing with this situation.

"I am happy to hear the minister speaking of integrity. I hope it will come in handy in informing us how the issue of relegation was changed so suddenly. This doesn't make sense to the lay man on the street. Were favours done because of friendship matters?

#### Fate

"If we wanted to increase teams, why didn't we promote those from the lower divisions and let those facing relegation suffer their fate? It should be clear that I am not fighting anyone here and don't even know the team but I am appealing to the minister to look into this matter before 2018," he said.

Shongwe was seconded by Senator Lungile Gama, who wanted to know why other teams were getting special favours.

"I would like to know from the minister why we are protecting other teams. Such conduct brings back unnecessary talk of favours for this certain team, including boardroom decisions in the past. I would really like to know why our

relegation has eyes," she said.

Also submitting on this matter was Senator Menjeni Mahlalela, who said it was the right of the tax-paying nation to get an explanation on this issue.

#### Relegation

"As Parliament we are not interfering with football but we have to ask on behalf of the nation what happened in the issue of 14 teams. As a football person I know that relegation of some teams may not be good for football but why then do we have to wait until the last minute to help when we see these teams struggling for a long time?"

'Don't bluff the nation by making statements that this is a pilot programme, what is it that is being piloted here as the increment of teams is not new in football?" he said.

The senator also added that it was unfair to

the other team to be subjected to play-offs and that such treatment resulted in them failing to make the cut.

"Let us be honest if this team was at the bottom of the log, would it have been subjected to play-offs?" he said.

Deputy Senate President Ngomuyayona Gamedze, however, came to the rescue of the minister, stating that the ministry had no say over this matter. "The ministry is not in charge of relegation but the clubs. Not even the FA president had a say because if it were the case it wouldn't have gone down at any given time because it is closer to his heart. Highlanders did not ask to be saved from relegation, the team has gone down before," he said.

In response, the minister echoed Gamedze, stating that the ministry was not responsible for such decisions taken at other forums.


