

UNION CALLS OFF SEC STRIKE, Tractor hire: E200/hr, 10 000 hours covered BONUSES TO BE PAID SOON

The Swaziland Electricity Supply Maintenance and Allied Workers Union (SESMAWU) has called off the planned strike by Swaziland Electricity Company (SEC) workers because of two important rea-

The first was that SEC got a court order yesterday interdicting the workers from engaging in the strike action from the Industrial Court.

The second reason was that SEC has assured workers that they will be paid their bonuses, which was the source of the industrial standoff, soonest. Both SESMAWU and SEC have communicated to the



workers about the proposed strike action. SEC has warned workers to respect the court order and abandon the strike action.

"Management would like to inform all employees that on Sunday, November 5, 2017, the Industrial Court issued an interim order interdicting SESMAWU and its members from participating in the intend-

ed industrial action of converging at the head office or participating in any action calculated or likely to constitute a deviation from normal working activities. All employees are reminded that SEC is an essential service and our agreements do not allow employees to engage in a strike action," reads the memo issued by the company.

In the same token, SESMAWU responded positively by issuing a memo too to its members as regards the strike action.

"Management has promised to push our issue with the intent of paying us our 2016/17 bonus soonest. SEC management's worry is that should SESMAWU continue with the purported strike, such could jeopardise their efforts to have our

issue addressed and again this might also affect SCOPE's attention in as far as dealing with the matter at hand is concerned. SEC management has again emphasised that our bonus issue is being pushed through the relevant authorities on a daily basis. We therefore plead with you SESMAWU members to reconsider the resolution upheld as we collectively strive with SEC management to have the bonus issue resolved amicably.

The SESMAWU EXCO shall update you accordingly on the progress dear comrades. We have been served with a court order stopping the action and continuation of the intended action will result in contempt of court," the union wrote to its members.

SWAZI TV EDITOR GETS 3 YEARS FOR ASSAULTING WIFE

Swazi TV News Editor Nkosinathi Dlamini has been sentenced to three years imprisonment for assaulting his wife Lungile Makhanya.

He was however given a fine option of E4 000.

Dlamini was sentenced by Magistrate Lucia Lukhele on Friday.

This was after the court found the accused guilty of the assault charge

he was facing. The news editor during his court appearance maintained his stance and denied ever assaulting his wife. Dlamini claimed that he was the one who allegedly suffered endless abuse in silence at the hands of his wife and has scars all over his body to show for it.

However, the crown represented by Fakazi Mngomezulu submitted that the evidence led in court proves beyond reasonable doubt that the accused is guilty of the offence he was charged with. When leading her evidence before court, Makhanya did not deny biting the accused per-

son and told the court that the bite marks on Dlamini were caused by her in self defence.

The complainant informed the court that the accused assaulted her with an open hand on the head and further sat on top of her and strangulated her.

Makhanya informed the court that it was not the first time the accused assaulted her as there were other incidences where she was given a hiding. She informed the court that the scars which the accused displayed before court claiming that he was being abused by her were

just old scars which some she had nothing to do with. Makhanya in her statement also confirmed that on the day of the incident the accused tried grabbing the house keys which were in her bag but she refused which led to the accused forcefully grabbing her bag which is something that led to a scuffle between them. The court did not dispute that the two were involved in a confrontation and that they were injured in the process. The court further revealed that it seemed like the accused was not remorseful of his actions.

PM presented with double bed by the love of his life

YESTERDAY Ndzingeni came alive when the newly-wed Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini's wife Gugu Primrose Simelane presented gifts (umhlabiso) to her husband and in-laws.

The umhlambiso ceremony attracted hundreds of people who came to witness the coulourful ceremony at the prime minister's parental home.

The two lovebirds tied the knot in a lavish wedding ceremony on Saturday which was held at the Matsapha Evangelical Church.

The prime minister, his wife and her bridal party were clad in orange outfits which brought vibrancy to the whole ceremony.

First to be presented with the gifts was the prime minister's sister, Lomagugu Magagula, who was presented with a stylish blanket and a carpet. Thereafter, Simelane presented her husband a blanket and a carpet before proceeding to the other Dlamini family members.

The gifts presented to the prime minister included a bed, a sofa, bedding, a carpet, two blankets, a kist, serving plates, a tea set and a set of towels. Before being presented with his gifts, his wife started by sorting out the bed for her husband and then she invited him to see his umhlam-

The prime minister was all jolly as he held his bride's hand as she ushered him to the bed, where they sat together, while Simelane was seen wiping Dlamini's face before proceeding to the sofa which was amongst

While Dlamini was seated on the sofa, Simelane presented him with the tray with a tea pot and a cup and thereafter a set of bowls.

Farmers should prepare themselves to pay E200 per hour for tractor hire services from government.

This was revealed by Minister for Agriculture Moses Vilakati. He communicated this in a ministerial statement in the House of Assembly. Vilakati encouraged all Swazis to take part in farming this season in order for the country to have enough food and fight hunger.

The minister expressed hope in that there were many chances for the country to realise a bumper harvest this season.

"This year, the meteorology department has informed the nation that rainfall predictions indicate a normal to above normal rainfall during the 2017/2018 farming and cropping season. This means the chances of El Nino effects are low," Vilakati said.

In that regard, the minister called upon farmers in high rainfall areas to prepare for the ploughing season.

With the government tractor hire service standing at E200, it seems as if people are not finding it that steep.

The minister reported that already 50 000 hours had been registered for ploughing countrywide.

Out of the 50 000 hours that were registered, 10 000 had already been ploughed. The total number of tractors available for ploughing stands at 331, out of a total fleet of 400 tractors. The rest of the tractors were being attended to as they had mechanical problems.

Contributed

In addition to that, Vilakati mentioned that the private sector contributed 135 tractors up to now.

He encouraged more tractors owners from the private sector to assist.

Most RDAs had enough diesel for ploughing and the ministry was monitoring the situation closely with the Central Transport Organisation (CTO) to ensure timely sup-

On input supplies, like fertiliser and seeds, he said the ministry was working with suppliers and had prepared a delivery schedule. The unfortunate part, in this regard, was that farmers paid very late for the inputs, hindering their smooth distribution countrywide.

Despite this, the minister thanked the Swaziland National Agricultural Union (SNAU) for mobilising farmers to assist in the delivery logistics.

The plan was to complete the delivery Operation, which was already in progress, within the next two weeks.

On another note, the minister said his ministry, working with National Maize Corporation (NMC), had seconded 10 extension officers to NMC for the smooth running of the ploughing and planting season.

In 100 days Swazi Mobile records 100 000 subscribers

IN just 100 days of going live, new mobile telephone company Swazi Mobile has attracted over 100 000 users to subscribe to their network.

This information was revealed by the company's Brand and Communications Manager Macford Sibandze who said the company had hit the target of getting 100 000 people to subscribe with them in the first three months of going live.

The company, which reportedly had 91 100 users two Fridays ago was able to register over 8 000 users on

said they were overwhelmed by the response from the public and that

"We now have more than 100 000 active subscribers which is a landmark and we have not stopped persuasions.

Wait until our network is all over the country then we will launch massive aggressive outreach programmes. If in three months we have these numbers what about after a year?" wondered Sibandze, without expecting an answer.

"The company has made great strides in penetrating the mobile industry and 100 days down the line it is now welcomed as a serious player and competitor. We made a psychological mindset shift and persuaded the people to buy into our business model.

Fortunately we made our advent when the people were readily waiting for us and when we arrived we delivered," he added confidently.

He stressed that they didn't want people to support Swazi Mobile just because they have 100% Swazi ownership.

"No! We are more than that and we wanted them to buy into our excellent and quality deliverables. And if you do that, the quality service becomes your agent of marketing and through word of mouth people become our ambassadors. We don't have a pity or empathy budget but we are a bank of excellence and quality. Go anywhere people will tell you about our cheapest data and internet speed," he said.

The company went live in August.

The King said Zambia was a great country to visit and that it also held good trade prospects for both countries to explore.

He was hopeful that his visit would strengthen these prospects. The King recently hosted President Lungu to the official opening of the Swaziland International Trade


During this visit, Lungu indicated that Zambia was ready to promote trade with Swaziland as relations between the two countries were growing stronger by the day.

Mfuwe, according to Wikipedia, is the main settlement of South Luangwa National Park in the Eastern province of Zambia, serving the tourism industry and wildlife conservation.

This village holds the record of the highest temperatures ever recorded in Zambia with 42.8 degrees Celsius set on October 26, 2011.

The king and queen were welcomed by the president and the First Lady at the Kenneth Kaunda International Airport on Saturday evening before being hosted to a private welcome reception at the State House. His Majesty is accompanied by Inkhosikati LaFogiyane while members of the local delegation include Foreign Affairs Minister Chief Mgwagwa Gamedze, Prince Masitsela, Emazinyane Sicalo, Majaha, Lindani and Chief Officer in the King's Office Dr Vincent Mhlanga, among others.

MINISTER GOES AGAINST PM ON DAGGA DEBATE

MINISTER of Housing and Urban Development Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza is headed for a collision course with his boss, Prime Minister Dr Sibusiso Dlamini over the dagga legalisation debate.

The minister, who never shies away from being a supporter of the legalisation of dagga in the country, once again addressed the topic, branding those who speak negatively about dagga as being irresponsible.

The prime minister is the lead vocalist of the faction that does not take kindly to having dagga legalised.

It would have been assumed that under the collective responsibility spirit, the minister would take the Cabinet's leader position and abandon the dagga debate because of the stance taken.

The PM vowed that dagga will not be legalised during the term of office of the government he leads.

However, Minister Mabuza aimed shots at dagga legalisation critics.

The minister was addressing over 500 residents who had converged at the Mhlambanyatsi Inkhundla where he is an elected MP on Saturday.

He said people should refrain from concentrating on the negatives caused by dagga abuse only but look at the bigger picture.

He said there are many positives and medicinal products that can be harvested or produced from dagga if it could be legalised.

He said the delay in the legalisation of dagga has cost the country a fortune in terms of monetary values.

"I have personally seen people getting healed by products made of dagga. I am actually one of the first MPs who stood up in Parliament to support the legalisation of cannabis," the minister said. "Umuntfu lotsi insangu ihlanyisa bantfu is irresponsible," he said.

"In fact, as a country we have been

The minister, who never shies away from being a supporter of the legalisation of dagga in the country, once again addressed the topic branding those who speak negatively about dagga as being irresponsible. left behind when it comes to legalising dagga. Countries like Lesotho have overtaken us. The United States of America has conducted studies on how dagga products can be of benefit. Even the University of Jerusalem has launched studies and research on dagga and its biological effects with an eye toward commercial applications," said the minister. Mabuza's statement goes against that of the PM who stated that his Cabinet would not look at options of cultivating cannabis for improving the economic situation of the country.

The premier said this in April during a breakfast meeting he had with the Swaziland Editors' Forum.

The breakfast meeting was held at Sibane Hotel in Ezulwini.

"There are ways in which we can improve the economy and create jobs, but this cannot be done by growing cannabis," Dlamini said.

The prime minister was also taken to task in May this year in the House of Assembly.

The MPs wanted him to clarify why he was talking about Parliament matters in other forums.

The MPs also wanted to know if Cabinet would help Parliament as it investigated on the viability of growing cannabis in the country.

Dlamini told the MPs that his Cabinet was not ready to help Parliament with whatever recommendation they would give to Cabinet.

He told the MPs that maybe the next Cabinet could help in that regard, but not his Cabinet. He told the MPs that maybe they could move a private members' motion to try and direct government to enact legislation related to cannabis. Government would not table a bill related to cannabis.

In March this year, Nkilongo MP Hans Steffen moved a motion for a five-member Parliament Select Committee to look at the possibilities of using dagga for health and industry. Steffen mentioned that the economy of the country would improve a great deal.

He was seconded by Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini. The committee was given eight weeks to table a report in the House. They had to extend because of some difficulties. A report was finally tabled on October 18. Some mistakes were identified in it and the MPs had to pull it out of the House to fine tune it. It is expected back in the House before MPs proceed on their break this year.

FACT: No arrest in FBN ATM bombing



Mamba was speaking to this publication yesterday afternoon.

Mamba lamented that the public was misled by the Times of Swaziland that published a story alleging police had arrested a suspect.

"We were shocked as the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) to read a story in the Times of Swaziland that was published on Friday that arrests have been made in Pigg's Peak in connection with the bombings of the ATM at Solani's in Mbabane. This is not true as nobody in Pigg's Peak has been arrested for that crime, we have no idea where the story originated from



because even police in Pigg's Peak have confirmed with myself that no such arrest has taken place, we encourage journalists to please confirm stories before writing them," said Mamba.

Police are still looking for suspects in the bombing incident where the thugs went away with cash.

KING CREDITED WITH REDUCING **FOREST FIRES IN NORTHERN HHOHHO**

COMMUNITY Liaison Officer at Peak Timbers NhlanhlaNxumalo has credited His Majesty King Mswati III for the low rate of commercial forest wildfires experienced in Northern Hhohho during the past winter.

Nxumalo, interviewed by this publication yesterday, said the King had spoken to all senior traditional leaders in Northern Hhohho during the annual Buganu ceremony at Buhleni in February to allow forestry companies conduct vigorous fire awareness

"Forestry companies in Northern Hhohho owe the King a huge debt of gratitude for his pivotal role in decreasing the number of wild forest fires in the region.

Fortunately, we as a commercial forestry company were informed by our own sources that during the Buganu ceremony early this year in Buhleni, the King called a meeting with all senior traditional leaders in Northern Hhohho to discuss how to best handle the issue of wild forest fires.

In that meeting they discussed the things that were hampering the development of the region as a whole and the fruits of this meeting were seen in the office of the Hhohho Regional Administrator (RA) Prince Tshekedi,

which permitted companies to carry out more vigorous fire awareness campaigns by involving traditional leaders from the various chiefdoms," he said. He said after the traditional leaders got involved they allowed the companies to first teach them about the dangers of the wildfires.

"These leaders then went on to teach their communities on the dangers of wild fires and while these exercises were taking place we then approached the schools to continue teaching the youth on the dangers of these forest fires. Now it seems that all our hard work has paid off, because this peak fire season being winter, we recorded very few wild forest fires," he added.

SUSPICIONS HIGH AS MAN FOUND HANGING FROM ROOF

A family from Mgubudla near Ngwane Park was left shocked after they made a gruesome discovery of one of their own who had taken his life by hanging himself while inside his house vesterday morning.

A source close to the matter said the man, who was discovered by a family member, never showed any signs that he was contemplating taking his own life.

Information gathered is that the deceased's family suspect foul play in the whole incident as they refuse to accept that the man had taken his own life.

The family alleges that he was murdered and then brought back to his house where he was hanged so that it may look like he committed suicide. Information gathered is that the deceased was last seen on Saturday by family members, only to be found dead yesterday.

What raised suspicions among family members is that the deceased did not even leave any note or send anyone a message or made a distress call to any member of the family. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed that a matter of suicide was reported to them.

Mamba stated that as police they are investigating the circumstances leading to the death of the young man. He went on to say even though the general suspicion is that the unnamed man had committed suicide, investigations were ongoing. Although he would not name the deceased man as police were still to inform his next of kin, information gathered was that the man was married and had a child. Worth noting is that in the same area not long ago it was reported that a lifeless body of an old man was discovered near the banks of Mgubudla River. Information gathered is that the deceased was epileptic and he might have fallen into the river during one of his seizures leading to his death.

'Malpractice not possible in Matric exams'

DIRECTORS and principals of schools offering Matric in the country have emphasised that malpractice during exams of the South African syllabus was almost impossible as papers are normally guarded by police officers.

In fact, the directors and principals are of the view that running examinations of the South African syllabus was safer than those of the local syllabus.

This made part of the submissions made before the parliamentary select committee which met the schools' administrators at U-Tech High School last Thursday.

The schools' administrators dismissed reports to the effect that govemment was reluctant in signing a bilateral agreement with the South African government because of fears of the costs that government would incur when there has been malpractice reported.

The administrators said the issue of malpractice was a mere excuse used by government in sabotaging the syllabus.

U-Tech Principal Mavela Shongwe disclosed how exam papers are conveyed from South Africa to Swaziland on a daily basis under heavy security provided by both governments. Shongwe said they had made an

arrangement with the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) to escort the exam papers from the Lavumisa Border Post and straight to the exam room.

The paper would then be escorted back to South Africa on the same day after the pupils had written it.

In the meantime, papers of the local syllabus are normally delivered at the schools at least a month before commencement of the exams.

Shongwe said if there was any risk that government had to be worried about, it was that of keeping exam papers at the schools for such a long period of time, something which is being done by the Examinations Council of Swaziland

Moreover, Shongwe reported that invigilators for the Matric were also trained and accredited by South African officials before the first date of exams, "With all these precautions, there is no room for Swazi pupils to engage in malpractice," said Shongwe.

He was echoed by Pro-Learning Institute Director Ernest Magongo who added that even teachers who were not accredited to oversee the exams were not allowed to go anywhere near the exams room, even when there was no paper in session. The exam room is normally guarded by police officers throughout the

Cop killed in car crash at Nsongweni

A police officer based at Mafutseni Police Station died in a car crash at Nsongweni along the Nhlangano/Hlatikulu public road.

The unidentified constable met his death last Thursday. Two vehicles were involved in the horror crash, with one of them towing another one car from the Nhlangano direction towards Manzini. The vehicles collided head-on, with the police officer who was in one of the cars killed on the spot.

The police officer was driving a Toyota D4D which was towing another vehicle, a white Nissan Navarra. Both vehicles

were completely wrecked due to the impact.

The officer was trapped inside for quite sometime as means were made to retrieve him from the wreckage, and when he finally was retrieved he had died.

Those who attended the accident had no clue as to what exactly caused it but others claimed it was the tow-bar size which probably contributed to the fatality. The accident, which attracted scores of people, saw traffic along this road delayed as police and the Fire and Emergency team had a hectic time trying to clean the mess on the road and resuscitating lives.

Members of the public, some being residents around

Nsongweni, joined other onlookers with many of them still not sure what could have led to the fatality. The driver of the other car, a Nissan Navarra was in pain and did not even notice that the police officer was dead before he was taken to hospital. Police mouthpiece Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed the tragedy and the fact that a police officer based at Mafutseni Police Station was killed.

"It's true that the deceased was a young police officer based at Mafutseni. We can't disclose his identity at this stage. We are, however, passing our condolences to his family and friends," said Supt. Mamba when called yesterday.

'SCU-UNISWA MERGER A BIG NO'

THE mooted merger between Swaziland Christian University and the University of Swaziland (UNISWA) should not be allowed.

Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe stated in Parliament last Thursday that Cabinet was in a secret mission of merging SCU with UNISWA.

He even mentioned that Cabinet knew about the deal he was talking about. Shongwe ended up by vowing that he would fight so hard to ensure that such never happened. Not even a single Cabinet minister stood up to dispute Shongwe's submission. On Saturday, one local weekly newspaper exposed government's mission to make that process a reality.

Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini also shared the sentiments of his Mbabane West counterpart, when called yesterday on the issue.

He said as MPs they would not allow SCU to become part of UNISWA. "I believe SCU and government should negotiate a way forward. We, as the select committee, will oversee that transition to make sure interests of SCU and students are not being trampled on," MP Sitezi said.

Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini also echoed the sentiments shared by MP

Sitezi. He said it would not be good for the country to let that happen for now.

"This would undermine the principles of free-market economics. Allowing private institutions like SCU to exist in the country would be helpful to government because government alone would not be able to provide all the educational needs for the Swazi citizens." he said.

However, he said that should not mean that anyone could introduce fake problems just because government encouraged running of private businesses in the country. Government would then play its role of ensuring that everything was done in order.

He said it would not be wise for government to take over the institution now because the King had already said the teething issues that government and SCU had should be ironed out.

The Parliament committee would oversee that and ensure it happened.

MP Menzi said any takeover of the institution should not be allowed because the King had issued a directive to the effect that life should be put into that institution.

The Nkhaba MP was of the view that if the affected parties were to work honestly in this matter, the university would be of great help in 10 years' time. The university would help the country in saving money that was spent by government in sending Swazis to countries like South Africa, Russia and others for programmes offered by the institution.

MP Menzi made an example of a situation in communities.

He said people of a homestead do experience a stage where they are at each other's throats. Authorities of that community do not hastily take over that household, but they rather send a mediator to solve the problems of that household. No household would be allowed to take over the household in trouble.

Parly committee won't be more active

THE Parliament Select Committee is not going to be as active as the technical task team appointed by Cabinet to work on SCU.

This was said by Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini when asked to state what would be done by the Parliament Select Committee. The Nkhaba legislator was speaking in his individual capacity as an MP from Nkhaba Constituency. It must be noted though that MP Menzi is also part of the committee.

The MP stated that the committee was still to meet with other concerned parties to find out how the committees would work cooperatively, for the good of the university.

This should be the case because His Majesty the King said there should be a harmonious working relationship between all the parties involved.

Dlamini said the committee would not be that active as the other committees, but would be working in ensuring that the teething problems between government and SCU were ironed out. They would then report back to the King, if there was a

Parly Committee should help in drafting new govt-SCU MoA

A Parliament Select Committee working on the Swaziland Christian University (SCU) saga should facilitate in drafting a new Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) between government and SCU.

This was an opinion expressed by Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini, when asked what exactly would be done by the Parliament Select Committee, now that His Majesty King Mswati III has ordered government to re-open the SCU on Wednesday last week.

It is worth noting that MP Sitezi was saying this as an individual MP. He was not speaking on behalf of the committee. The King also ordered the select committee to continue working on the matter until the situation at SCU was under control.

The Parliament Select Committee includes Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Paul Dlamini, House of Assembly Speaker Themba Msibi, Dvokodvweni MP Musa Sitezi Dlamini, Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini and Nkwene MP Sikhumbuzo Dlamini.

MP Sitezi said they would work on ensuring that a new Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) was signed between government and SCU. The MoA should be done after all the workers at SCU have been paid. In other words, the MoA, according to the MP, should be negotiated, not coerced.

The prevailing situation could not be conducive for any MoA to be signed because SCU could agree to anything because of the situation they were in

MPs have been complaining about the way in which SCU has been treated compared to other universities. The university had been given a subvention of

about E2 million, instead of E27 million. At the time when the university was closed the workers were reported to have not been paid their salaries paid by government.

The situation, according to MP Sitezi, was conducive for any agreement to be signed. The SCU party should be paid their salaries first and their misery should be dealt with first. This would allow them to apply their minds when signing the MoA with government. They

should not be in a compromised position

to sign the MoA.

The institution should also have a financial controller. The controller should be seconded by the ministry of finance and report to that ministry. This would help the institution in avoiding a situation of mismanaging funds, because that deeply affected the performance of the institution.

The MP also emphasised on doing all these activities while SCU was in operation. He said the students should be

allowed to be in class and no time should be wasted just because there were problems that were attended to.

This committee was appointed by a Cabinet sub-committee, which was also appointed at Cabinet level to deal with the discrepancies found at SCU.

The sub-committee included Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula, Minster of Health Sibongile Simelane, Minister of Education and Training Phineas Magagula (chairman), Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini, Minister of Economic Planning and

Development Prince Hlangusemphi and Attorney General (AG) Sifiso Khumalo.

To establish the correction of the issues that led to the suspension of the university, a technical committee had been established to conduct financial audit and develop strategies to re-establish SCU. The committee consists of technocrats from different government ministries and departments. This committee would report to the Cabinet subcommittee.



ELECTION WINNERS SPEAK DEVELOPMENT, UNITY IN MBABANE

BABANE - In today's article we introduce the 12 people that won the Mbabane Local Government Elections on the 28th of October 2017.

In the following interviews, they reveal their plans and targets for their different wards as they are soon expected to assume

1. Zeph Nkambule
"What I want to achieve as Ward Councillor in this term is to help the municipality be understood by the people from my ward. I have observed that the Council often has good programmes for our communities but these are wasted or understood because residents do not understand most of the good initiatives that are brought about to the people by the Council. Take for instance in Ward 1 Council has been encouraging residents that have been allocated plots to pay for the properties which however has not been received well by the people and in the long run it has caused negative publicity for the Council. That is a problem when no one bothers to unpack these good initiatives by the organisation can in the long run harm relationships. Residents and the Council must work in harmony. Service delivery is also a very sensitive and critical part of the relationship between Council and its residents".

Musa Dlamini (Ward 2)

"There are a few numbers of things I would like to address. Firstly want to introduce Neighbourhood WatchSchemes to reduce the high rate of crime. I also wantCouncil to assist in having recreational facilities in Ward 2 and the youth tends to be idle and end up being involved in illicit acts and crime. The issue of poor roads has been headache for this part of the city, especially at Qobonga and Sitibeni. I wish something can be done either resealing those roads or rather patching the potholes there. There is also this issue of street lights, which I believe they are a necessity in this day and age. Also Wrad 2 needs two or three youth projects.

Mbutfo Nhlengetfwa (Ward 3)

As a councillor for Ward 3 I would like everyone to have access to council stamp, since Council stamp is hard to get, it can only be accessed at Mangwaneni. It is hard for Mvakwelitje residents to have their documents stampedand I believe this matter can be solved easily between the Local Community Committee (LCC). will also ask Council to help Mvakwelitje residents by constructing concrete pathways because that part of Ward 3 is uneven, houses get flooded during the rainy season because it cannot be controlled because of the terrain.

4. Sikhatsi Dlamini (Ward 4)

Mbabane is growing very fast and with that growth comes the responsibility to maintain the beautiful infrastructure that we have around the city and we in Ward 4 are focusing on that as one of our key goals. We are happy that Swaziland Local Government Project (SLGP) has seen the city develop its roads and we are very impressed by the work that has been on Gwamile road.

Also we want the city to have facilities for many sporting codes not just soccer, I believe we have many talented people in our city but without the infrastructure we will never know the potential of our

Then there is also the thorny matter of the bus rank which we all agree something needs to be done because it is very congested"

5. Arnold Dlamini (Ward 5)

Mbabane has a development plan, it's my wish to oversee implementation of the said plan to the latter.

Communication between Council and Residents is a challenge, wish to see improvements in this part. An LCC has been established in one of the ward areas, it will be good to roll up this concept to other

Security is another challenge requiring urgent attention, it will be good and fair to establish neighborhood watch schemes in all areas falling with the ward.

Lastly, recreation still pauses a challenge in the city not just ward five, to will be a huge success for Mbabane to broaden this sector in the near future.

Sikhumbuzo Dube (Ward 6)

As a returning councillor for ward 6 I have identified a number of problems. Firstly there's a lack of participation by all Mbabane residents. We need people to participate in the goals. I also want to see all policies e.g indigent policies because

I also want to see the municipality make use of our public open spaces and I know Eveni falls under those that are earmarked for a public partnership project (PPP). I happy that in Ward 6 we already have a number of capital projects completed but then focus should now go towards tarring feeder roads that are still untarred. Then, accountability and the matter of financial statements must be looked at and match the common approaches used by other organisations.

Sithembiso Hlanze (Ward 7)

For the duration of my term as a Councillor there a few number of issues I would like to address. The main problem in my ward is the building ban and allocation of plots. This issue has been going on for a long time and its hindering development. For example at Sitibeniarea there are informal settlements there and there roads are not tarred, they use community water yet the place is in the boundaries of Mbabane town. I would also like to meet with the ratepayers association to amend the rating act to be changed and be suitable for the way of life of people currently. The Municipal has programs for example, the International leadership programs whereby kids go to USA to be trained on leadership skills. I would propose that when these kids come back, they become active in the communities and teach their peers on what they have learnt during the Academy. I would also suggest that the Municipal Council create awareness on these programs especially the ILA so that residents can become aware on such programs especially the youth.

MkhontaThandayena (Ward 8)

For Ward 8, we obviously have a serious challenge with potholes and having tarred roads in Extension 3. I want the Council to also look at the possibility of having a market structure built for vendors at Macobolwane.

Vusimuzi Thulani Dlamini

I want Council to really put an effort in uplifting residents in my ward through its Local Economic Development wing which should be instrumental in empowering our communities. I also believe that Council should look into ways of addressing the rates issue. Another point that must be addressed is the lack of recreational facilities especially in Ward 9 and I am also determined to help the residents form Neighbourhood Watch Schemes to fight crime. It is also my opinion that community meetings nolonger work and we must come up with better ways to help us engage with residents.

Sabelo Magagula (Ward 10)

During my last term as a councillor for Ward 10 I noticed that there is a lack of participation of ratepayers on programs and meetings on my Ward. To solve this matter I would like the formulation of working committes (LCC) for the effectiveness of programs and development. I also plan on lobbying parliament for renewal of outdated legislations for example, the rating act with the adoption of council policy (indigent policy). I would love that government subsidise the vulnerable group. For the duration of my term I am planning on speeding up the programme of pegging and allocation of plots to formalise the informal settlements. I am also planning to address the issue of street lighting in my ward as it tends to be a security threat for residents. I would also address the issue of neighbourhood watch schemes. Another pending issue is the issue of water in my ward as the residents still struggle with water as some are still using community water. Another point that must be addressed is the lack of recreational facilities in Ward 10 especially for the out-school youth.

Smangaliso Gama (Ward 12) 11.

First and foremost I would pledge with the Municipal Council to lower the price of plots so that there can be affordable plots for everyone. There is also this major problem which is the building ban, this matter is delaying development and building materials are going up daily, so this delaying people to build permanent formal

structures. I would also like to introduce empowerment projects whereby people will be taught entrepreneurial skills so they can start their own businesses and be able to pay rates.



He fined him E1200 or 12 months imprisonment. It is worth noting the court showed leniency to Mhlanga as it ordered that his fingerprints should not be taken.

REMOVE DRINKING HALLS FROM NEAR SCHOOLS - UMPHAKATSI



KA-LANGA Umphakatsi has called upon the Lubombo Regional Education Office (REO) and Siteki Town Council to jointly work towards the removal of drinking halls and bars which are situated close to school premises.

Drinking halls are said to be having a negative effect on the academic performance of the pupils as they would abscond classes and go for drinks at these otlets. This transpired during a speech and prize giving day at Lubombo Central High on Friday.

Member of the inner council of Ka-Langa David Shiba said the umphakatsi was worried by the mushrooming drinking halls situated close to school premises.

Apparently, there is one situated less than 30 metres away from the Lubombo Central schools, just across the road. Shiba said they had received

reports to the effect that some pupils would be found at the drinking hall during school hours and in full uniform. He also noted that the pupils would be seen sharing drinks with elderly residents. Shiba said this also

translated to pupils being uncontrollable and disrespectful to teachers.

He then urged the town council to review the kind of businesses which were allowed to operate close to schools' premises.

Shiba noted that the Lubombo Central schools were not the only ones facing the problem of bars being situated nearby as other learning facilities within the town have reported similar complaints.

Disturbing

On another note, Shiba urged teachers to remain professional and be exemplary to the children. He said it was disturbing to have complaints of teachers behaving unprofessionally in the midst of children.

Meanwhile, school committee Chairman Mbokodvo Vilakati warned parents against renting flats for their children.

Vilakati said the school has received reports to the effect that some drug pushers had taken advantage of pupils staying alone in rented flats and used them to sell their illegal stuff.

The pupils would be rewarded with food hampers and, or money for rent. Parents were urged to take pupils to the nearest school to avoid having them to rent flats.

TOP 10 maize farmers who delivered the most grain to the National Maize Corporation (NMC) this year are in for an unprecedented treat as the organisation is sending them to an all-expenses-paid trip to neighbouring South Africa tomorrow as part of the prize package for the enhanced CEO's Award competi-

In an interview, NMC Marketing and Communications Manager Nokwanda Dlamini-Masuku revealed that the CEO's Award was established three years ago by NMC CEO Sabelo Msibi as an incentive to farmers who brought the most maize to the corporation.

Introduced

"When the CEO Award was introduced in 2015, the top 10 farmers who brought the most maize to NMC rewarded with free farming inputs of their choice.

"While NAMCOM aims at inspiring competitiveness among farmers while simultaneously imparting technical knowledge and skills for continually improvement of maize yields per unit area in the country, the CEO's

Award, on the other hand, awards those farmers who actually bring their maize to NMC," she explained.

In previous years, said Dlamini-Masuku, the overall winner of the NAMCOM often signified a certain level of maturity in terms of maize production, resulting in the respective farmer being excluded from the competition in subsequent years so as to encourage new entrants a fair competing field.

"The CEO's Awards were then introduced to ensure sustainability and continuity, in terms of monitoring the production of that particular farmer as well as to ensure their steady growth. While NAMCOM awards farmers

with the best yields, the CEO's Awards award those that bring large volumes of their yields to the NMC," she said.

RETIRED COP DREAMS OF BEING A MILLIONAIR

A retired police officer is now dreaming of becoming a millionaire and wants to see his dream coming to fruition

Mduduzi Frank Zwane, aged 64, has started working on achieving his dream and is already involved in a number of projects as a way of establishing the family business empire.

Zwane retired in 2013 whilst holding the rank of inspector and his last work station was at Siteki in the Lubombo regional police headquarters under the Intelligent Branch (IB) department.

He is now a resident of Maseyisini where he has embarked on a number of projects which are raking in thousands of Emalangeni for the family. The family is into piggery, livestock, public transport and chicken businesses, which are all operated within their piece of land which is over a hectare in size.



"I served in the police service for over 37 years, which is almost four decades. I spent almost all my working days in the police service but it was only after my retirement where I sat down with my wife (Nomsa) and worked on a plan of starting projects which would not just to keep the family going but make us millionaires. I am about to live that dream as almost all the projects are now flourishing and generating income, which is something that never happened while I

was still employed," said Zwane.

Zwane said he did not regret having spent all the years working and having not achieved much but now since he was not answerable to anyone, he was enjoying being at home as he was fully concentrating on the projects which he dreamt of while still young. He said being employed was a good thing but it also had its disadvantages, especially if one does not plan. "That's the problem with our education system as we are trained to be employed and not to be employers. If the 37 years I spent in the force I was focusing on these projects I started four years ago, by now I would not be a millionaire but a billionaire.

I am not complaining, however, as even in the police service I gained valuable skills and knowledge which I am now applying in these projects which I believe will make me a millionaire," said Zwane.

Piggery core business for the family

OUT of the several business projects that Mduduzi Frank Zwane is operating, piggery is the leading source of revenue and he believes that's where the family business strength

"Raising pigs has made me become a reputable farmer not just here at Maseyisini but even in other areas around Shiselweni. Pork is in demand, a number of my clients are butchery owners.

I have customers as far as Matsapha, including individuals. With the festive holidays already

approaching, we now have orders. However, it's not like the piggery business only flourishes during the festive season but it's a business that is doing well throughout the year," said Zwane.

Zwane said he was impressed in the manner the piggery business was progressing.

He said almost weekly, two or three pigs were sold. He said for quality pork to be produced, the

pigs should be well taken care of. He said a certain hygiene standard should also be maintained for the pigs to produce quality pork.


"The shed where these pigs are kept should be a clean.

We take care of our pigs like we are taking care of our own lives.

RETIRED police officer Mduduzi Frank Zwane says within the piece of land where his home is situated at Maseyisini, it is also reserved for cattle.

"I am also into livestock which is a project I used to like even one approaches us, we make a during the time I was a boy. I sell cattle to anyone, including butchery owners. It's a good project but not as good as that of piggery," said Zwane.

Zwane said raising cows was not something easy, especially in a peri-urban area like Maseyisini. "There is no grazing land around here which means I have to also buy their feed. Livestock farming has its own challenges and you have to be patient," said

Zwane said he was planning to start dairy farming business which he said also had lot of money. "Right now, we only have cows which we only sell when there is a need. If somedeal. As for butchery owners, they now know where to buy a cow for quality meat.

For social events or family gathering of any nature we sell at a reasonable price. Next year, we will be starting dairy farming business. There is no one supplying milk in this community and we have already done our homework in as far as this project is concerned," said Zwane.

Family transport business flourishing

AFTER his retirement almost four years ago, Zwane has also joined the transport business industry.

Zwane is a proud owner of a fleet of kombis operating under the 'Mangweni Transport'. All his kombis service local routes with some used as 'school bus' transporting children as well as employees to their different work stations, mostly in the textile industries. He said being in the transport industry was nor child's play as he has to monitor every-

"I took a risk when joining the pub-

lic transport business and at first, it did not work to my expectation but as time progressed, I noticed changes.

I now don't regret taking that risk as this business is working wonders for me now.

My kombis are hired almost every month end while others are servicing the local routes.

With the festive season already here, it's also during such time of the year where we see the business flourishing," said Zwane.

Zwane said his wife Nomsa

(LaMasuku), operates the kombi business while he focuses on the other family businesses.

"My wife is the driving force as even when I feel like giving up, she gives me the strength.

Sometimes transport business causes you headaches, especially when you cash far below what you expect.

My wife does not give up even when some of our vehicles are making no money, she keeps telling me that we should soldier on and advised me that we should not expect to make profit without spending first. She is my financial advisor," said Zwane.

Water scarcity delaying family's dream

SCARCITY of water at Masevisini has delayed retired senior police officer Mduduzi Frank Zwane from achieving his goal of being a mil-

Zwane said all the projects he embarked on when retiring nearly four years ago were digging in his pocket. He said the piggery, livestock and chicken businesses operated by the family relied on water. He said a result; he was forced to fork thousands of Emalangeni to buy water almost daily.

"For all the projects we are talking about, water is a must. Breeding and raising pigs, water should always be there. It's been an outcry I found in this community when I arrived several years ago. I find myself having to buy water almost every day and I hire transport for the water to be delivered here.

The problem of water has delayed us in a number of ways. By now I should have reached my target of being a millionaire but because of water scarcity, I see that dream taking longer than I anticipated," said Zwane.

Zwane then made a special appeal to anyone who can sponsor him in drilling a borehole. He said having just a borehole would see all his businesses flourishing without any hindrance.

Water is life, but here at Maseyisini we are all struggling

when it comes to such an important commodity. There are people who we

tasked with the responsibility of changing our lives as a community but these individuals are only good in lip service. They know themselves and some of them do not even bother to assist me access funds for my businesses. All

that we have is through our sweat and toil as we are financing ourselves from the pockets. We have not been able to get financial help from organisations like Inhlanyelo Fund because of certain people who have stopped some of these financiers due

to some having their own agenda," said Zwane.



HE MUST PAY ME E8 000 MAINTENANCE FEE MONTH

A Mbabane based businesswoman wants the court to force an attorney to fork out E8 000 for child maintenance.

Welile Masuku, who owns a media company, has taken the father of her two children to court for allegedly failing to maintain the children since their separation in 2015.

Masuku was married to Mlungisi Simelane in terms of Swazi Law and Custom in 2011. Simelane runs his own law firm and he represented himself in court as he opposed the application made by the applicant.

In her application, Masuku stated that the monthly expenses for both children amounted to E9

Expenditure

"The children's basic monthly expenditure far exceeds the sum of E8 000 which I state is reasonable and affordable to the respondent who is gainfully employed as a sole partner in his law firm," she said.

She alleged the money would cater for things such as school fees, clothing, food, medical expenses, accommodation and entertainment.

Masuku said she is currently unemployed and relies on irregular media consultancy jobs, which she said do not provide enough to cater for the children and her personal needs.

Neglected

She alleged Simelane had refused and neglected to contribute anything towards maintenance of their children. She is represented by Mkhwanazi Attorneys.

Masuku asked the respondent to make the payments to her attorneys. However, Simelane dismissed the allegation that he was neglecting his children.

He alleged that according to his knowledge they are supposed to provide equally for the welfare of the children. He said they agreed that Masuku would buy food and clothes for the children.

Responsibility

"My responsibility was to cater for school fees in the private school we selected," he said.

He further complained that Masuku declined employment which came with a salary of over E29 000 per month.

Simelane said he was also struggling to pay on time due to the loss his law firm was currently making. However, he highlighted he had negotiated terms with the school.

He further said he was spend-

ing over E20 000 on each child, considering school fees, food, clothing and medical expenses. "I have two other children, who are older than the ones we have with Masuku," he said.

He asked the court to force Masuku to produce a statement of her earnings for the past six months whilst adding that he would do the same to prove that

and that he was not getting paid.

Welfare "The court should order parties to cater for the welfare and the maintenance of the minor children according to the percentage to be determined by the court. The par-

should select responsibilities of maintenance of the two to fulfil and thereby be ordered to do so," he said in his answering papers.

He further said the minor children should be admitted at an affordable school as the E45 000 he is currently forking out at their school was too much for him.

Railway to pay E335m in Rail Link compensation

SWAZILAND Railway is expected to pay about E335 million in compensating people who will be affected by the Rail Link project.


The Swaziland Rail Link entails the construction of a 150 kilometre new railway line from Lothair in South Africa to Sidvokodvo in Swaziland and the revamping of two existing lines in both countries.

The overall project will cost E17 billion once completed. This line has been designed to carry 150 general freight wagons at a time and will be operated as a seamless service without stopping at any of the borders either into Swaziland or out of Swaziland.

Estimated

According to a second quarter report from the ministry of public works and transport, the compensation would be carried out on Swazi Nation Land (SNL) and on Title Deed Land (TDL). The total compensation for the project is estimated to be E320 million for SNL and E15 million for TDL.

Eight land parcels were affected on TDL, compared to 235 households on SNL, of which 57 structures would only have affected struc-



will be wholly resettled to new land. Below is what was done by the Swaziland Railway in the second quarter (July to September, 2017).

On the TDL, the owners of the eight affected farms have been engaged in the negotiations and "in principle" agreements reached with six of them. Negotiations were in progress with the outstanding two farm owners (De Souza and Mndzebele families).

 The Mndzebele farm is to be re-evaluated, following an advice from the ministry of natural resources and energy. This is due to conflict of interest concerning the Mndzebele family's valuer, who also undertook similar services for Swaziland Railway. The process of engaging an independent land valuer to reprogress.

Agreement

 The De Souza family had requested for time to present the compensation offer to their board and further meetings were to be held with them and an agreement would be reached by the end of the next quarter (October to December 2017).

 Two of the six TDL parcel owners, with whom the "in principle" agreements were reached required that the crop on their land be also evaluated and compensation values determined for loss of future

earnings. The process was to engage a crop valuer to evaluate and determine payable compensation for crops was in progress during the quarter.

 On SNL, negotiations had not commenced, pending gazetting of affected properties. The process to gazette the eight title deed properties and 235 households on SNL commenced in the quarter and a gazette was to be issued by the end of the next quarter.

Preparatory work, which included review and updating of the asset and infrastructure survey by the mapping of affected assets, was ongoing for the 57 households which would have structures relocated within the existing premises.

GIRL (14) RAPED FOR NOT GIVING SUSPECT MONEY

A friend to an alleged rapist told the court that the survivor together with her friends were assaulted for not providing the alleged rapist with money to buy cigarettes.

Siboniso Mavuso of Mahwalala was paraded as a state witness in the rape case involving Sifiso 'Ngodvwana' Dlamini. It is alleged that the incident took place at Nkwalini, Zone 2 on

Dlamini was told he is facing a serious crime mainly because the survivor was a minor (14 years old) and he did not use protection while

The survivor also resides in the same area.

It is alleged Dlamini stabbed the minor child with a sharp object and further threatened to kill her. According to reports, the survivor cried throughout the ordeal. Therefore, the crown made it clear such an act will be a life-long trauma for the minor child.

While clad in formal wear, Dlamini pleaded not guilty to the charges he is facing.

When Mavuso took to the witness dock, he said he knew Dlamini and further said he was with him on the day of the incident but stated that he did not witness the rape.

"At around 8pm, Ngodywana asked me to accompany him to fetch his girlfriend. I agreed and along the way we met the survivor together with other minor children.

Ngodvwana asked them to give him money to buy cigarettes but the children told him they did not have money and he started assaulting them," he said.


Mavuso said he asked his friend to stop assaulting the children but he was told the minors deserved it since they failed to give him money. "One of the minor girls rushed to her homestead and came back with her mother. Ngodvwana produced a knife and threatened to stab the woman but I held him back and injured my hand in the process," he added.


He added that the suspect dragged the minor child on the tar road and continued to assault her. He said the survivor was taken to a place by the suspect and when he tried to reason with him he did not listen to him. "I had to rush to work at Nkosana Bar where I work as a bouncer and also responsible for locking the place. When I left I tried calling someone to come rescue the minor child since the suspect did not want to listen to me," he said.

Mavuso said the suspect told him he was punishing her for not giving him money. He further said the suspect had threatened the mother to one of the minor children with assault. "He told her he was from Hilltop and thus he would deal with her," he said.

Mavuso said he did not suspect Dlamini would rape the minor child. On the other hand, Dlamini denied that he raped the child.





IAPOLOGISE

JOHANNESBURG - On Monday, October 30th I misrepresented the #BlackMonday protest action by many South Africans when I posted images on my Twitter feed.

I illustrated my post about the necessity of moving beyond old racist ideas about South Africa using images of people wearing clothes marked with the apartheid era South African flag.

The post was ill-conceived and the attempt to engage in that particular debate poorly timed on my part.

I apologise unreservedly and unequivocally to everyone who was offended by my actions.

While I may have wanted to make a point about contemporary South African politics and protests about crime and criminals, I did so without doing the basics.

I never checked the veracity of the photographs and fired off a Tweet which did not contribute constructively to that debate but skewed it.

I used old, rather than contemporaneous photographs.

I acknowledge now and should have done so then, that even if the photographs were from the day of the protest, they did not represent the majority of those who had gone on those protests.

Furthermore, in not verifying their origin, I failed in my professional duty as a journalist.

Additionally, it was discourteous to the journalist who did take some of the images, who had warned against their polemical misuse.

I accept that I distributed images unrelated to the specific newsworthy event in ways which made it appear as if they were.

My own personal anger against, and political opposition to lingering racism in South Africa may have informed my actions, but they do not excuse them.

Even though my mistakes of omission (not checking the origins of the images) were not committed with malice, the consequences remain no less serious than had they been.

South Africa continues to be blighted by issues of racism, and my attempt to be a productive participant in the battle against it has backfired, and not only on me.

In distributing those images with the lack of due consideration I have done the very cause so close to my heart much damage, and it has given me reason to pause and consider how better to engage in anti-racist activism.

The protests on 30 October 2017, across South Africa, were organised to oppose murder in South Africa's rural areas and I could have seen them as a rallying point to oppose violence in any form.

And while there were indeed other images showing the presence of the old South African flag at some protest sites, those images were not truly representative of all the events.

I take full responsibility for having created that impression in my Tweet.

I continue to feel that racism and displays of symbols of white supremacy are fundamentally unacceptable in the democratic society we all hope to build.

It is my sincere hope that any future campaign against violence in rural areas – or anywhere in South Africa – will be characterised by unity of purpose among all South Africans.

Partly what I have learned from this experience is the limits of my own worldview and political position against racism.

I, therefore, commit to engage in working with those who teach about 'race' and racism in South Africa and elsewhere to learn better ways to channel my desire to combat racism, both as a citizen dedicated to the democratic project in post-apartheid South Africa, and as a professional journalist in a developing state committed to helping to undo the injustices of the past and the present.

The standards I am expected to hold the world to in my role in the fourth estate must apply more stringently to myself.

Once more, I apologise unreservedly for my ill-considered conduct and hope that with time my misguided actions on 30 October 2017 can be judged in light of my full record as a journalist and a citizen.

JOHANNESBURG - Staff are unhappy about possible zero per cent salary increases as the new board tries to restore credibility, contain costs and increase revenue. It is nearly three weeks since I was

appointed with my 10 colleagues to serve on the new SABC board for a five-year term. The unprecedented challenges at the public broadcaster are well known and the new board has begun its work with vigour and urgency to ensure good governance, financial stability and programming excellence. During this short period, the new board has been through an intense induction process, appointed board committees and taken a number of crucial decisions to try and stabilise an organisation that has been plagued by maladministration for nearly a decade.

Given that all our top executives are serving in an acting capacity, a major priority is the appointment of a new CEO, COO and CFO. While

SABC faces long recovery

no board decisions have been taken yet, we are involved in an intense and detailed process to scrutinise and find the right executives to lead the SABC into the next era.

Continuing where the interim board left off, we are determined to turn the SABC around and entrench its place as the shining light for independent public broadcasting in South Africa and on the continent.

In order to achieve this, we need the support of all our stakeholders, including our management and staff, Parliament, the minister of communications and, most importantly, the South African public.

Our management and staff have kept the organisation going during a time of extreme dysfunction. Our people at the SABC are undoubtedly our most valuable resource. We empathise with and support those who have suffered intimidation as a result of the behaviour of rogue executives. We have approached the courts to recover money we believe was acquired improperly. People must be held accountable.

With the firing of COO Hlaudi Motsoeneng and the disciplinary action against acting CEO James Aguma and his subsequent resignation, the SABC has begun the process of healing and rejuvenation. We will not rest until all those implicated in misconduct, illegality and corruption are removed from the SABC, following due process. There have to be consequences for those who played a part in destabilising this vital public institution. Huge losses and massive debts. The new board received a detailed handover from former members of the interim board and we have met members of the Special Investigating Unit to get a progress

report on the various investigations the interim board asked for.

The inescapable reality

The inescapable reality is that this recent period of chronic governance failure has led the SABC down a road of huge losses and massive debts. As will be presented to Parliament this week, in the SABC's sec-


quarter report, mismanagement by previous SABC boards and executives has left a significant hole in the corporation's finances and it will take us time to move the dial in a different direction. This board has agreed to defer its own fees while it assesses the SABC's finances.

We continue to pursue a government guarantee – not a bailout – from Treasury, to deal with the overhang of approximately R650m in debt we

THE LITCHI FARMER WHO WOULD BE PRESIDE



A lawyer, poet and businessman, Mathews Phosa does not allow government tenders in his family and is passionate about farming.

Mathews Phosa beams as he hands me a framed copy of cartoons from late 2001, which he keeps in a small personal library at his family home in White River, Mpumalanga. The City Press cartoon shows Phosa standing next to businessman Tokyo Sexwale and Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa, all of them looking down at a kneeling Steve Tshwete who profusely apologises for claiming that the trio were plotting to topple former president Thabo Mbeki. At the time, Tshwete was minister of safety and security. He died in 2002.

A second caricature, by cartoonist Bethuel Mangena, is even more brutal. It shows the three men carrying long whips and chasing Tshwete down a road. Phosa sees the humour in it, and cracks into laughter.

'We are hitting him," he chuckles. Later, as we talk, it becomes clear that that part of his life was not a laughing matter.

Solved

At one point during that episode in his life, former justice minister Penuell Maduna called him. Maduna suggested the "conspiracy thing" could be solved if Phosa and crew apologised to Mbeki.

A furious Phosa rejected the idea and told Maduna in rather colourful words to go jump.

"I have never been involved in a plot so I'm not going to apologise to Mbeki at all," he told Maduna. A later investigation cleared the three lead-

Fast-forward to 2017 and it is no more a rumour that Phosa is among a throng of candidates vying to take over from President Jacob Zuma at the ANC's national elective conference in December.

Unlike some of the other contenders Lindiwe Sisulu, Jeff Radebe and Ramaphosa - Phosa started his presidential campaign on a front foot. He already had the human infrastructure that he had set up in 2012, when he unsuccessfully contested the post of ANC deputy president at the ANC's Mangaung conference.

However, as it becomes clear later that day, when he speaks at a graduation ceremony of one of his protégés, Phosa's Forces of Change anti-Zuma grouping has weakened following the birth of Julius Malema's Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) in 2013. Many of his backers opted to jump the ANC ship and join the

new party.

But first we have a family lunch with the children and grandchildren where Phosa, a lawyer and a ruthless businessman, shows different sides of himself: a family man and passionate farmer. The lunch is a weekly Saturday ritual, explains Phosa's wife, Pinky, an ANC MP

For the next hour or so, the discussion around the table is about business, ethics and how to handle money. Phosa's firstborn daughter Moyahabo, now married with three children, runs her own public relations company. Her younger sister, Tshepiso, runs a Puma filling station in Nelspruit. His other two children Matlhatse and Lesika are absent.

Tshepiso says her father is health conscious and drinks

only water and tea. "He avoids rice and pap and he eats green salad. He works out at the farm," she says, referring to a litchi farm a few minutes from Nelspruit.

A golden rule in the family is that government tenders are banned. This is despite Pinky Phosa being a former deputy speaker, speaker and MEC in Mpumalanga.

"You cannot live off the fat of the state because you have access to it," says Phosa, adding that "these are not the Duduzanes"-a reference to Zuma's

son Duduzane. Moyahabo says her father is so strict that whenever she asks for "a push" - a loan - for her business she always has to pay it back, with interest. Tshepiso is renting the petrol station's site from her father.

"The principle behind it is that I should learn how to pay my dues," says Tshepiso. Phosa quips: "There is nothing free in life. You must pay back the money."

Phosa speaks passionately about his litchi farm, where he frequently goes

to spend quiet time with the family. "You get to know your children better when you are calm," he says. The 22-hectare farm has up to 6 000 litchi trees. The litchis take seven years to harvest and the trees are in their sixth

"You have to have the patience of the farmer before you harvest."

He says a culture of farming, and game farming, is big in the family. He breeds buffalo, sable antelope and black and white impala, "just like Ramaphosa" on another farm near Tzaneen. This includes a hunting farm. He breeds Bonsmara cattle and exports avocados to Europe, competing with countries like Mexico.

"I'm more of a farmer than people realise. It is one of the biggest parts

country," he says.

He has deliberately kept all this out of the public eye.

"My businesses are cheekily independent because first I banked on myself. I made millions from consulting and put that into business. I did that very quietly, so today many ANC people do not know my businesses because I hide it and keep it private.'

He rejects as "superficial nonsense" and "politics of the ignoramus" the suggestion that he was in the pockets of Afrikaner businesspeople.

"What do I have to do with Afrikaners? Afrikaans is a subject I excelled in and had 85% of my subjects in Afrikaans," he says. He writes poetry in both English and Afrikaans.

When he was approached to be president of the Afrikaanse Handelsinstituut, he got former president Nelson Mandela's blessing.

"The ANC embraced the move, describing it as a breakthrough for national unity and nonracialism."

Likewise, he says, it is wrong to claim that Ramaphosa is in the hands of the Jews.

"I will defend Cyril because I know him. We come from university together, we were in the same classroom. I have never known him to be a puppet of the Jews."

Treasure

The two were students at the University of Limpopo's Turfloop campus in 1972 and both led student activism. Later in life, Ramaphosa became ANC secretary-general and Phosa followed later as treasurer-general. He put Ramaphosa in his ANC finance committee. "We have known each other for many years. I know his first girlfriend and he knows mine."

He does not mince his words when he says that Indians control Zuma.

"Of course they run him and there is enough evidence." He says many of his colleagues in the ANC agree that they were wrong to think they really knew Zuma.

"He was the kindest of all uncles and leaders. He was charming, always laughing and worrying about all of us. He had a soft human side about him which was very nice. I think in a way he still has it.

"You would not see the greed aspect of him because it did not manifest itself. Some say he must have been very deceptive. Others say Mbeki should have warned all of us because he was close to him. They were like twins." At one point during the interview he looks at his phone and giggles. He seems pleasantly amused.

"I'm getting more nominations from Eastern Cape. It is amazing," he says as he hands me his phone. The message comes from his campaign organiser in that province.

MAIZE YIELDS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE IMPROVING

DEPUTY Prime Minister Paul Dlamini says ever since government started providing farming input support to farmers, there has been some stability in terms of maize yields even during periods of erratic rainfall.

Having realised the impact of the input support programmes, Dlamini said government would push for the extension of the programme to sorghum and beans for the benefit of low rainfall parts of the country.

The deputy prime minister was speaking during the official launch of five satellite soil testing laboratories and accompanying structures under the Food Security Project last Thursday. He said the aim of the project was to ensure that the country

improves the production of maize to a level that meets the national grain requirement of 130 000 metric tons.

He said the establishment of soil testing laboratories was a wise decision and an extremely critical intervention by government.

Five satellite laboratories were established under the Food Security Project at the Motshane, Ntfonjeni, Ka-Langa and Ngwemphisi Rural Development Areas (RDAs).

The other one was established at the Nhlangano Farmer Training Centre.

"I should mention that ever since the period government started providing the input support to farmers in the country, we have seen some stability in terms of yields, even during periods of erratic rainfall. I have been assured by the ministry's officials that the yield of maize is expected to increase as soil conditions improve for a period of up to five years," he said.

Dlamini said the soil testing laboratories were the source of valuable information and an important guide to the type of intervention required.

The deputy prime minister urged farmers to fully utilise these facilities and also use the results obtained to make informed decisions with regards to optimising their productivity.

The government's food security project funded by the EXIM Bank of India also supported the construction of vermin-compost sheds, tractor service workshops and training rooms. Dlamini said these structures form a package on offer as means of improving farmer's resilience to the negative effects of climate change, improving service delivery and to pick up the pace towards the achievement of food security goals.

"For food security to be achieved, the main pillars should be in existence. That is the availability, unhindered access, affordability and nutritionally balanced food," he said.

"It is, therefore, the goal of government to make sure that as a country, we are able to produce food in its different forms, maize grain being the primary target," he further stated.

SD's trade with UK looks safe for now in post Brexit

ENGAGEMENTS between the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) and Mozambique and the United Kingdom (UK) have started as UK's exit from the European Union (EU) looms.

This is according to the international trade department which is domiciled under the ministry of commerce, industry and trade. The UK is expected to officially exit the EU in March 2019 and this had been anticipated to jeorpadise various agreements including Economic Partnership Agreements (EPAs). "In this regard, an engagement between SACU including Mozambique has started with the UK," said the department in the ministry of commerce, industry and trade second quarter performance report.

The department further disclosed that the UK has expressed its firm commitment to maintain the current market access to SACU and Mozambique has to the UK.

"The engagement with the UK has given the country an assurance that there will be no disruption of trade between Swaziland and the UK post-Brexit," reads the report in part.

According to the report, the country's exports to the UK include mainly citrus fruits, canned fruits, clothing and apparel, sugar and sugar confectionery, raw hide and skins, as well as handicraft inclusive of glass and glassware, sandals and article of animals.

Producers

On the other hand, the country imports toys, games and sports items, furniture and bedding accessories, medical and surgical instruments and apparatus, electrical machinery and sound recorders and producers, nuclear reactor boilers and machinery.

Going forward, the department said it seeks to conclude the trade negotiations with the UK before March 2019, when the UK will formally exit the EU.

ICT CAN REVOLUTIONALISE DELIVERY OF AGRICULTURE EXTENSION SERVICES

THE third annual Institute of **Development Management (IDM)** conference has explored the beauty of e-learning and how it could benefit the Southern African **Development Community (SADC)** region, including the county.

This was contained from research papers presented during the third research conference held last week at the Royal Swazi Spa Convention Centre in Ezulwini.

"E-extension enables agricultural extension service providers to reach large numbers of clientele; the purpose of the study is to assess the level of avareness of agricultural extension practitioners regarding ICT opportunities in agricultural extension work. Awareness

radio 84 per cent, and smart phones 84 per cent, television 81 per cent, cell phones 79 per cent and laptops at 50

He said the different electronic platforms in Lesotho were promoted by different factors which could also assist farmers in the country to learn from neighbouring countries.

"Social media, as facilitated by the increasing use of cellular phones, is clear demonstration that ICT is socially compatible and has potential to revolutionise the delivery of agricultural extension services," he said.

Education

On the other hand, Gloria B Samunzala from IDM Botswana explored challenges faced by higher education system's e-learning in Botswana.

Digital learning within the SADC region was further encouraged by the researcher, exploring challenges experienced by the region's higher education institutions in implementation of e-learning and their possible solutions.

"By comparison with developed countries, they found that most challenges concern the individual since cost of infrastructure support and maintenance is not an issue (Moakofhi, et al 2017). Tarus, et al (2015); Naidu (2003); Islam et al (2015) indicates that majority of e-learning initiatives implemented in Sub-Saharan countries tend to fail, partially or totally due to the absence (or inadequacy) of infrastructure," she said. She said the e-learning process further requires that facilitators should be motivated to do the work.

Implementation

"This comes from Sikwibele and Mungoo (2009) who reveals that lack of interest and commitment among majority of the teaching staff to use elearning in teaching is another challenge hindering the implementation of e-learning," she said.

Samunzala said the use of ICT for distance education makes access to the technology an enabling factor, which is access to the quality of the connec-

She said the reliability of this connection and the bandwidth affects the users' ability to access the full range of the content needed.

"We have lost about five per cent of our client book overall. It's the ones that have decided to terminate," Dlomu says, pointing out that the figure does not include the non-renewal of contracts.

DA to push for better Gautrain subsidy deal

JOHANNESBURG - Taxpayer's will, over and above the R30 billion Gautrain construction price tag, have paid well over R50 billion for this service if current subsidy levels continue, the Democratic Alliance said yesterday.

The current Gautrain subsidy was the largest single item of expenditure in the budget of the Gauteng roads and transport department, making up roughly 35 per cent of its budget for the past financial year, DA spokesperson Justus de Goede said.

The recent announcement of the expansion plans for the Gautrain had focused attention on the possibility that this high subsidy would be perpetuated should a new contract be signed.

This contribution made it possible to subsidise each passenger trip by around R60, according to the auditor general's estimation.

"Virtually all public transport systems worldwide are subsidised, but this is an unusually high proportion, to the extent that the Competition Commission will



be looking into the matter in its current investigation into public transport in South Africa," he said.

"If the annual subsidy for Gautrain maintains a level of between R2 billion and R3 billion for the duration of the concession, the taxpayer would, over and above the R30 billion construction price tag, have paid well over R50 billion for this service."

The Gautrain was an efficient and extremely well-run public transport

mode, but unaffordable for many residents of the province.

The root of the problem lay in the contract that the province signed initially with the consortium of concessionaries; the subsidy contained a large component known as the ridership guarantee, which effectively protected the concessionaries against ridership figures falling below a threshold determined before the system started operating.



Scottish minister quits over 'inappropriate behaviour'

LONDON - A junior minister in Scotland's government resigned on Saturday after admitting "inappropriate behaviour", the latest official to quit in a deepening scandal over sexual harassment and abuse that has been sweeping British politics.

Childcare Minister Mark McDonald said in a statement that he apologised "unreservedly to anyone I have upset or who might have found my behaviour inappropriate. ..."Some of my previous actions have been considered to be inappropriate - where I have believed myself to have been merely humorous or attempting to be friendly, my behaviour might have made others uncomfortable or led them to question my intentions,"

He said his behaviour was "entirely my own responsibility", adding that by resigning, he hoped "neither any particular woman or my family will be the focus of undue and unwarranted scrutiny".

A government spokesperson confirmed McDonald had tendered his resignation to First Minister Nicola Sturgeon on Saturday.

He is expected to re nain a law-

maker in the Scottish Parliament, representing Sturgeon's Scottish National Party in Aberdeen.

Several claims of harassment and abuse have emerged against British politicians in the wake of the allegations by dozens of women against Hollywood tycoon Harvey Weinstein.

Bush Sr. voted for Clinton, called Trump a 'blowhard'

WASHINGTON - Former US president George H.W. Bush voted for Hillary Clinton in the 2016 election and called Donald Trump a "blowhard" who was driven by "a certain ego."

His son George W. Bush left his ballot blank and said of Trump: "This guy doesn't know what it means to be president."

The revelations, contained in historian Mark Updegrove's "The Last Republicans," available in bookstores later this month, represent the strongest criticism to date from the Bush clan on why their Republican successor is uniquely unfit to hold office.

"I don't like him," the elder Bush told Updegrove in May 2016 before the elections in November of that year, according to excerpts of the book obtained by AFP.

"I don't know much about him, but I know he's a blowhard. And I'm not too excited about him being (our) leader."

While travelling to Tokyo on Air Force One, Trump walked back to the press cabin and responded to the Bushes' criticism.

"I don't need headlines. I don't want to make their move successful," he said.

The younger Bush was skeptical about thencandidate Trump's chances in a race in which his younger brother Jeb was an early favourite.

"Interesting, won't last," was his initial reaction when Trump entered the race.

Once the bombastic billionaire real estate magnate secured the Republican nomination, Bush expressed surprise and worried about Trump's lack of humility, and thus his inability to recognize his own limitations and surround himself with more knowledgeable people.

"As you know from looking at my family," Bush said, humility "is a certain heritage, that's what they expect, and we're not seeing that" in Trump.

After Trump said, "I'm my own advisor," Bush quipped: "Wow, this guy really doesn't understand the job of president."

The comments are sure to escalate a long-running feud and come after George W. Bush gave a speech last month that condemned bigotry, bullying and lies in US politics in what was widely seen as a broadside against Trump even though the president was not mentioned by name.

NO DICTATOR' SHOULD UNDERESTIMATE US RESOLVE - TRUMP

TOKYO - President Donald Trump yesterday warned that "no dictator" should underestimate the United States, in a thinly veiled reference to North Korea, which is likely to dominate his Asian tour.

Speaking to cheering servicemen at Yokota Air Base just west of Tokyo, Trump donned a military jacket offered to him and issued a threat that "no one, no dictator, no regime and no nation should underestimate... American resolve".

"Every once in a while in the past, they underestimated us. It was not pleasant for them, was it?" roared Trump.

"We will never yield, never waver and never falter in defence

of our people, our freedom and our great American flag."

Trump's marathon trip comes with the North Korea crisis at fever pitch, with US bombers running sorties over the Korean peninsula and fears mounting of another Pyongyang missile test. The president's first stops are Japan and South Korea -frontline US allies in the effort to force Pyongyang to abandon its nuclear programme, and the two countries with most to fear should a full-scale conflict break out. *AFP*

Austrian party head quits over sex harassment claims

VIENNA - Prominent Austrian politician Peter Pilz on Saturday quit Parliament and stepped down as head of his newly formed anti-establishment party over sexual harassment allegations.

"I've always fought for strict standards and these standards also apply to me," the veteran leftwing MP, 63, said in a state-

The announcement came after weekly newspaper Falter confronted him early Saturday with allegations of sexual misconduct.

A woman told the paper that an inebriated Pilz had groped her in 2013 at a major annual discussion forum in the western town of Alpbach.

"His hands were everywhere,"

she was quoted as saying by Falter.

The woman said two other forum participants eventually dragged the politician away.

Pilz said he could not remember the incident, but took the allegations "extremely serious".

However, Pilz rejected claims made last week by a female Greens member who also accused him of fondling her on dozens of occasions when he was still with the party.

Protesters detained at nationalist march

MOSCOW - Russian riot police on Saturday detained dozens of people at a nationalist anti-Kremlin march on a public holiday known as the Day of National Unity.Marchers at the event, which attracts nationalist protesters, shouted slogans including "Putin is a thief" and "freedom for political prisoners".Police in helmets and body armour moved in to seize activists, mostly young men, at the authorised event in Lyublino, a suburb of southern Moscow.

Saudis intercept ballistic missile

RIYADH - Saudi Arabia on Saturday intercepted and destroyed a ballistic missile over Riyadh after it was launched from conflict-torn Yemen, with debris landing inside the capital's international airport, officials said. Residents in Riyadh reported a loud bang near the airport after the missile, claimed by Iran-backed Huthi rebels, was shot down, but authorities reported no major damage or loss of life. The attack underscores the threat posed by the raging conflict in Yemen, increasingly spilling across the border since a Saudi-led coalition began its military intervention in 2015. AFP

Study finds horse DNA in 10% of meat dishes

MEXICO CITY - A study in Mexico has found horse DNA in almost 10 per cent of the ground beef and meat dishes served or sold in public markets, butcher shops, street stalls and taco stands in five Mexican cities. Researchers at the School of Veterinary Medicine at Mexico's National Autonomous University analysed 433 samples of steak, ground beef and prepared meat dishes from businesses.

Macri to honour truck attack victims

BUENOS AIRES - Argentine President Mauricio Macri is set to travel to New York to pay tribute to the victims of the bike path truck attack and seek investments, his office said. Five of the eight people killed in the October 31 attack were friends from Argentina celebrating the 30th anniversary of their high school graduation. An Argentine national is also among the 12 people injured, while four other Argentines -- all from the same group -- survived the attack unscathed. Macri, who travels to New York with his wife Juliana Awada, is set to hold a ceremony at 9:00am (1500 GMT) at the site of the truck attack. AFP

Climate activists march to keep coal in ground

BONN - Thousands of demonstrators converged on Bonn Saturday ahead of UN climate negotiations demanding that governments step up action to halt global warming, starting with a rapid phase-out of coal-burning power plants. Decked out in red to signify their "Stop Coal" campaign, the protesters chanted slogans and beat drums as they snaked through the former West Germany capital toward the UN centre that will host the 12-day, 196-nation talks, tasked with implementing the landmark Paris Agreement.

Political parties unite to condemn alleged rape against domestic worker

BRONKHORSTSPRUIT-A45 year-old man accused of first raping, and then forcing his domestic worker to perform sex acts with his dog abandoned his bail application in the Bronkhorstspruit Magistrate's Court.

The accused sat stone-faced when he appeared before a packed court presided over by Magistrate Ignatius du Preez.

It is alleged that the suspect dragged the woman into his room on October 23, where he attacked her and forced her to perform acts of bestiality with his dog.

"If you are convicted of all these charges, you will face life imprisonment," Du Preez told the man.

Accused

The accused is facing 10 charges including rape, sexual assault, and malicious damage to property. He was arrested last week for allegedly raping a 41 year-old woman. The incidents allegedly happened in

Riamar Park, Bronkhorstspruit, on October 23.

The man's legal aid lawyer, Ehleketani Maluleke told the court that he was abandoning his bail bid, but did not give any reasons.

The State asked for the matter to be postponed to February 5, to allow for further investigations and to wait for the DNA test results.

Du Preez granted the postponement as requested, but warned that the case would continue on the next date even if the DNA test results were not available. "The defence's concern that it will be a long wait carries no weight because it is their choice to abandon their bail application. It is not the choice of the court," Du Preez said. Outside the court, hundreds of people, including members of the African National Congress (ANC), Democratic Alliance (DA) and Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF), sang and danced.

\$6m in Ebola funds went missing from fraud

DAKAR - Red Cross officials say nearly \$6m meant to help fight the Ebola outbreak in West Africa went missing because of suspected fraud. In one instance, an internal investigation found "likely collusion" between bank employees and former staff of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies. A statement says as much as \$2m was lost. The IFRC says it is working with Sierra Leone's Anti-Corruption Commission to "investigate and legally pursue any persons involved."

Just 2 dogs patrol for wildlife trafficking

JUBA - Leaping from the van, South Sudan's only two patrol dogs raced toward passengers disembarking a plane in the capital, Juba. After frantically sniffing their luggage, one dog abruptly sat in front of a wary young man and stared at his bag. Removing a piece of ivory from a side pouch, the man breathed a sigh. It was just a drill, though the dogs hardly need practice runs to sharpen their skills. Ivory and illegal animals regularly flow through this civil war-torn nation that advocacy groups say has become a critical hub for traffickers."

US forces to arm drones in terrorism fight

NIAMEY - Niger will allow US forces stationed in the country to arm the drones being used to track jihadists, having previously allowed their use only for surveillance, the government said. The decision comes a month after jihadists ambushed a joint US-Niger patrol in a volatile area near the border with Mali, killing four American soldiers and four Nigerien troops.But Defence Minister Kalla Moutari said the decision had been taken before the October 4 attack at Tongo Tongo.

US warns diplomatic staff of 'specific threat'

MOGADISHU - The US mission to Somalia on Saturday urged all of its nonessential staff to leave Mogadishu immediately following a specific threat against them at the capital's international airport. The warning came just hours after US forces confirmed carrying out their firstever drone strikes targeting Islamic State (IS) jihadists in the Horn of Africa nation."Due to specific threat information against US personnel on the Mogadishu International Airport, the US Mission to Somalia has directed its non-essential US citizen employees to depart Mogadishu until further notice," a statement posted on its website said.

Mourners left in shock after hearse bursts into flames

NAIROBI -Mourners were left shaken when a hearse carrying the body of a man burst into flames at Kimicha village in Kirinyaga County. The body of the man, who died last week in Ngong, was being ferried from Nairobi to Kerugoya area for burial when the incident happened. According to Benson Munyua, the driver of the hearse, the journey from the city went smoothly but on arrival at the village, he heard the vehicle backfiring before a huge fire emanated from under the vehicle spread out.

Fraud probe to delay Liberia run-off: commission

MONROVIA - A presidential election run-off in Liberia scheduled for tomorrow will be delayed by a Supreme Court fraud investigation, the National Elections Commission (NEC) said.

Former soccer star George Weah and Vice President Joseph Boakai are competing to succeed President Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, a Nobel Peace Prize laureate whose election in 2005 helped draw a line under 14 years of civil war.

The vote is meant to mark Liberia's

first democratic transition of power since 1944, but the Supreme Court this week halted preparations while it examined charges by third-place finisher Charles Brumskine's Liberty Party that the Oct. 10 first round was marred by fraud.

Following arguments by the Liberty Party and counter-arguments by the NEC, Chief Justice Francis Korkpor said that the court would give its decision at 10 a.m. (1000 GMT) today, one day before the scheduled poll.

"The election will definitely be delayed, but we don't know for how long," NEC spokesman Henry Flomo said. "The fact that the court will not rule until Monday is a delay.'

Boakai's ruling Unity Party has backed the Liberty Party's allegations and even accused Johnson Sirleaf, one of its own members, of interfering in the vote by holding private meetings with election magistrates.

Johnson Sirleaf denied the meet-

ings were inappropriate. Observers from the European Union and the Carter Center said they saw no major problems with the first round

Addressing the court's five justices, Brumskine cited "gross irregularities". In its complaint last week, the Liberty Party alleged various problems, including the late opening of polls, the absence of queue controllers and fraud by NEC officials.

MUGABE THREATENS 1 SACK VP AS WIFE BOOED

BULAWAYO - Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe openly pilloried his deputy and possible successor on Saturday, saying he might sack him, in a combative speech at a rally where his wife Grace was booed by some in the crowd.

The 93-year-old leader's remarks exposed tensions in the ruling ZANU-PF party over who stands to take power after him, an event only expected when Mugabe dies but a generational change likely to prompt bitter battles.

Vice President Emmerson Mnangagwa, nicknamed "the Crocodile", is one of the top candidates.

But Grace Mugabe - 41 years younger than her husband - has become increasingly active in public life in what many say is a political grooming process to help her eventually take the top job.

Mnangagwa has been accused by Mugabe loyalists of undermining the president and of fanning factionalism in ZANU-PF, which has already named the incumbent as its candidate for next year's presidential election.

Mnangagwa, 75, was appoint-

ed vice-president in 2014 and has been widely touted as the obvious successor to Mugabe, who has led the country for 37 years.

But a visibly incensed Mugabe unleashed wrath at his vicepresident, sitting nearby, when speaking in Shona in the opposition stronghold city of Bulawayo.

"We are denigrated and insulted in the name of Mnangagwa. Did I make a mistake in appointing him as my deputy?" Mugabe asked.

'You know nothing'

"If I made a mistake by appointing Mnangagwa... tell me. I will drop him as early as tomorrow. We are not afraid of anyone. We can decide even here," he said.

"If it has come to this, it is time we make a final decision," he added, telling Mnangagwa and his supporters they were free to leave ZANU-PF. News24

Ping slams proposed changes to Gabon constitution as 'autocratic'

LIBREVILLE - Gabon opposition leader Jean Ping on Saturday said he would try to scuttle proposed changes to the country's Constitution, describing draft changes as "autocratic" and liable to violate the principle of separation of powers.

We must thwart this constitutional revision," Ping told a crowd of supporters in an address at his home in capital Libreville.

"We need to derail it because it carries the seeds of the Republic's liquidation and... the establishment of a kingdom in Gabon".

The proposed changes specifically focus on "determining the relationship between the president and the government in case of cohabitation", "strengthening Parliament's oversight powers" and the creation of a Court of Justice to prosecute senior officials.

Adopted in late September by the Cabinet and soon to be debated in Parliament, the draft includes decisions agreed during a political "dialogue" that took place at the presidential palace in March, in an effort to resolve a crisis sparked by President Ali Bongo's re-election in August 2016.

Ping, a 74-year-old career diplomat defeated by Bongo by just a few thousand votes, maintains he was the winner of the poll, in defiance of Gabon's Constitutional Court, which upheld Bongo's victory.

The court ruled that Bongo won 50.66 percent of the vote and Ping 47.24 percent, leading the opposition leader to accuse the administration of electoral fraud.

Violence broke out days after the vote, and opposition figures say more than 50 people were killed in clashes. The official toll was only three dead.

Mugabe to appoint woman deputy, all eyes on Grace

President Robert Mugabe is set to appoint a woman deputy after a special ruling party congress next month, the first lady said on Saturday and added that there was nothing wrong if her husband appointed her.

The 93-year-old Mugabe has held power in the southern African nation since independence from Britain in 1980 and consistently refused to anoint a successor. He argues that the ruling ZANU-PF party would choose his replacement if and when he decides to

ZANU-PF rally in the second city of Bulawayo that the party would amend its Constitution this month and the changes would be adopted at a special December congress to ensure that one of Mugabe's two deputies would be a woman. Allowing Mugabe to appoint a woman deputy could scuttle the presidential ambitions of Vice President Emmerson Mnangagwa, who had been seen as a shoe-in to succeed Mugabe. Phelekezela Mphoko is the second Mugabe deputy, but lacks



LONDON - Tottenham Manager Mauricio Pochettino insists that he has not had his eye caught by rumours linking him with Real Madrid.





The Matsapha side won the entertaining encounter at the Mavuso Sports Centre 2-1 but there were no paramedics on the pitch side or ambulance present for the two Premier League matches at the venue. The Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) usually enlists the help of the Red Cross for paramedic services. The first match saw Green Mamba beat Red Lions 2-0. While there were no serious injury concerns in the first match, the second one saw Matsapha goalkeeper Khanyakwezwe Shabalala and striker Sidumo Shongwe rushed to Manzini Clinic after suffering differing injuries.

Shabalala suffered a concussion while Shongwe suffered a knock to his head.

Matsapha CEO Victor 'Mavikane' Dlamini expressed the club's shock at having no paramedics to assist them pitch side, which is a norm in every MTN Premier League match.

"We didn't understand why there were no paramedics at the stadium. We were shocked by that. There were no stretchers, no ambulance. We had to carry both Sidumo and Khanyakweze on our shoulders and used our own cars to ferry them to the clinic," he said.

Dlamini went on to add that the club was worried by its burgeoning injury list.

"Both Sidumo and Shabalala have suffered serious injuries. They were checked and discharged on Saturday and were ordered to return for Xray today (Sunday).

"They join Siphamandla Dlamini, Nkosingiphile Nkambule, Sifiso Maseko, Msimisi Ncanywa and Dennis 'Yuki' Masina on our injury list, 'Sawa' is also playing with an injury. We are worried but we will cope as a team. I would like to urge our supporters to pray for us during these hard times," he said.

The CEO then confirmed that Shabalala would miss Sihlangu's upcoming camp. Shabalala was named in Sihlangu coach Pieter de Jongh's 30-man squad for the November FIFA week. "Khanyakweze will be out for at least two weeks. That is what the doctors told us. We know that the FA (NFAS) requires even injured players to report for camp so we will follow all protocol and allow him to report for camp and also bring the doctor's report with us," he concluded.

Reports

Meanwhile, PLS COO Pat Vilakati said the organisation had not yet received a report on the two matches. "We usually receive our reports on Mondays and Tuesdays so we haven't yet received a report on the matches you are referring to. When we announce the fixture we also send invites to the paramedics so we don't know what happened," he said briefly.
