outh Africa's rating downgrade by Standards and Poor (S&P) and Flitch this week, two of the three leading rating agencies, to junk status is going to have a negative effect on the Swaziland economy, Finance Minister Martin Dlamini disclosed this week.

S&P on Monday and Flitch yesterday downgraded to junk status the South African economy which means the likelihood of debt that is in foreign currency being repaid is very

The South African government borrows money almost monthly to help pay its bills.

A leading economist and African Alliance Partner Sthofeni Ginindza said with now two of the rating agencies having downgraded the rating of South Africa, the junk status was now official.

Future

Dlamini when asked on the impact of the South African economy downgrade to Swaziland said; "A downgrade in rating (in this case RSA debt instruments) implies that the cost of borrowing will increase as investors in RSA government paper will be uncertain about the political future of the present government. This may also negatively impact on exchange rate of the Rand compared to other major currencies. "As the pricing of Swaziland gov-

ernment debt instruments is linked to similar instruments on RSA, this implies the cost of borrowing

exchange rate factor will also increase import prices and add to inflationary pressures."

He said the impact on Swaziland would be the same as Namibia and Lesotho who are all in the same Common Monetary Area (CMA) whilst Botswana will be affected to a less extent even though they were all members of the South African Customs Union (SACU)

S&P indicated that their future outlook was poor; hence they expected further downgrades going forward.

African Alliance Partner Ginindza concurred with the minister that the downgrade would have a negative effect on the country's economy.

Escalate

He said companies like ESKOM and Transnet survived on foreign debt, which would now escalate with both the country and the power and rail companies rating having been downgraded.

"Our economy is linked to that of South Africa and there is no way we will not be affected. But a weaker Rand or Lilangeni means different things to different people. For gov-

ernment which has to service its loans in dollars, it means paying more. But for companies that sell their produce in dollars it means more money.

"Until last Friday, everyone had managed to hold the line. However, all bets were off following the announcement that Pravin Gordhan had been fired. The result was laid starkly bare on Monday, when S&P cut South Africa long term foreign currency rating to +BB (junk status) with a negative outlook.

"The last time this happened was in 1994 when S&P assigned South Africa a below investment grade rating of BB. It took another five and half years

before the country's international rating was then upgraded to investment grade," Langa noted in his analysis. He said this would have adverse effects on investment, as it will

become more expensive for the gov. ernment to raise debt from local and foreign investors.

Langa said this in turn had a knock on effect in the private sector as corporate and consumer debt would become more expensive.

Anticipated

"This results in investment dropping as the anticipated financial return on projects becomes less attractive. In addition, the cost of refinancing existing debt becomes higher, particularly to corporates.

"To illustrate this in the real world context, the government is massively subsiding a number of State Owned Enterprises (SOEs) including SAA, SABC, Sanral and Eskom. It is believed the latter alone will 'burn' through some R300bn of the R350bn government guaranteed funding by 2020. This means the government will at some point be forced to raise more money to head off Eskom and other SOE burgeoning cash drain (for salaries, project spending and investment 'This will be both expensive and

potentially difficult. Notwithstanding the above, it is clear from the market reaction on Tuesday, investors were already anticipating the downgrade albeit, not quite so soon.

"In addition, markets typically overshoot on both good and bad news. Therefore, we believe there is a possibility the Rand will fall to around USD14.00 in the short term, before stabilising. This will be negative for any sector that relies on imports and financial companies. Businesses with high offshore exposure should be a stock market beneficiary (Sasol,

Police Service Bill returns to Parly on Monday

embers of Parliament (MP)s will resume official business during a sitting scheduled for the House of Assembly on Monday afternoon.

Topping issues on the agenda will be the much-awaited Police Service Bill of 2014. Clerk to Parliament Ndvuna Dlamini in a press statement yesterday alerted members that they would resume their sitting at 2:30pm while urging all of them to attend with-

He confirmed that the main issue on the agenda will be the above-mentioned Bill while explaining that the Bill seeks to regulate the recruitment, discipline and administration of the Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSPS). He said the Bill also seeks to put in place powers, duties, obligations and functions of the Police Service.

The Police Service Bill will culminate to the establishment of the much anticipated Police Service Commission, where service members will be disciplined if there is a valid grievance registered against them. In some quarters it had been criticised for giving the Police Service boss, national commissioner (NATCOM), too much power.

The Bill might attract a heated debate like in the past where Manzini North MP Jan Sithole said police officers should be allowed to join political parties, but not as leaders of those parties. Such is opposed by the Bill. Back in 2015, Sithole argued that police of being workers they had a constitutional right to choose whether to become tion or union.

Magistrate Phathaphatha checks himself into Psychiatric Centre

n a rather unexpected revelation, Manzini Magistrate Phathaphatha Mdluli yesterday disclosed how he checked himself into the country's psychiatric centre when revealing that he was a surviving patient of the National Psychiatric

The magistrate made this educative revelation during the celebration of the World Health Day at the Happy Valley Hotel yesterday morning.

His main aim of revealing such, he said, was to rid the country of the stigma that goes with checking in at the psychiatric centre. He proudly stated he was a survivor of depression and was happy he made the right decision of going for psychological evaluation and correction hence he was coping well now.

Depression

Yes I am a survivor of depression and I went for help at the psychiatric centre. This was as a result of my sudden transfer from the Mbabane Magistrate Court. There is nothing wrong with that and many people are scared and suffer in silence. I couldn't cope well when I was suddenly transferred from Mbabane and I'm glad I took the right step to seek help hence I can say I'm proud that today and I'm talking about it because I'm now okay".

The magistrate said everyone lived in an environment where there were a high number of cases associated with gender based violence that affect women and children.

He said such stigma associated with the psychiatric centre makes it impossible for the facility to attract patients who desperately need help.

The magistrate first explained that stig-

ma associated with depression had resulted in a lot of people believing that the facility was a place only for lunatics (kusetinhlanyeni).

He noted people must understand that the centre was a clinic for people who needed help hence the perception that it was a clinic for lunatics should be done away with.

He said just about anyone could seek help from this institution while observing that there was a need to root out the stigma that was attached to the centre so that many people could seek help on time. Declare

The magistrate further asked all the doctors and health professionals that were present during the event to publicly declare that depression was a societal challenge.

He said by so doing the challenge would be better tackled than the silence on the challenges faced by so many people in the country.

The magistrate when later sought for clarity by the Observer on Saturday on his revelation he reiterated his statement.

He also revealed the name of the doctor that attended his case and when the doctor was also asked she also confirmed.

The doctor said if the survivor was okay to disclose such then there was nothing wrong with telling the story to assist others that suffer in silence.

Meanwhile, depression is described as an illness characterised by persistent sadness and a loss of interest in activities that one normally enjoys, accompanied by an inability to carry out daily activities.

In addition, people with depression normally have several of the following: loss of energy; a change in appetite; sleeping more or less; anxiety; reduced concentration; indecisiveness; restlessness; feelings of worthlessness, guilt, or hopelessness; and thoughts of self-harm or suicide.

Depression is something that can happen to anybody and not a sign of weak-

It is treatable, with talking therapies or antidepressant medication or a combination of these. It is advised that people suffering from depression should talk to someone they trust about their feelings. Most people feel better after talking to someone who cares about them. It is also advised that they should seek professional help with local health-care workers or doctors as it is a good place to start.

Tips for depressed people:

 Keep up with activities that you used to enjoy when you were well

Stay connected

• Keep in contact with family and friends

• Exercise regularly, even if it's just a short walk

 Stick to regular eating and sleeping habits

· Accept that you might have depression and adjust your expectations

 You may not be able to accomplish as much as you do usually

 Avoid or restrict alcohol intake and refrain from using illicit drugs; they can worsen depression

 If you feel suicidal, contact someone for help immediately

Let's fight the moves to legalise dagga-Health PS

Dr Zwane said it must be noted that such a decision should not just rest with the politicians, as medical practioners knew the dangers associated with the usage of marijuana.

"This linkage is our biggest concern and thus let's unite and stop this movement to stop the dangerous economic moves disregarding the health of our people. "

Researchers suggest that marijuana smokers are diagnosed with depression more often than non-

It's likely that the genetic, environmental or other factors that trigger depression also lead to marijuana use. Some people with depression may use marijuana as a way to detach from their depressive symptoms

Emotions

Heavy users may appear depressed as a result of the dulling effects of the drug on feelings and emotions.

There also are links between marijuana and other mental health conditions. Marijuana use may trigger schizophrenia or detachment from reality (psychosis) in people who are at higher risk of psychosis. The symptoms of diagnosed psychotic illness may be aggravated if marijuana use continues.

There also is some evidence that teenagers who attempt suicide may be more likely to have used marijuana than those who have not made an attempt. As with marijuana use and depression, more research is needed to better understand these

MP Hans labels Mansoors mafia

kilongo Member of Parliament (MP) and businessman known for operating Matata Group, Hans Steffens has labeled Buy 'n Save Group operators, the Mansoors, as liars and unscrupulous businesspeople that operate a mafia in the country.

During his cross examination at the High Court. Steffens kept on using slanderous language towards the Buy N' Save Group, whose members were also in court in attendance on the day of the hearing. He made this allegation before Judge Titus Mlangeni.

This transpired in the marathon case where Steffens of LC Von Wissel Pty Limited is the applicant and the Spar Guild of Southern Africa is the first respondent and the Spar Group and Buy 'n Save Group are the second and third respondents respectively. SCP Kennedy is appearing on behalf of the applicant instructed by Robinson Betram and Spar is represented by SC Harper.

LC Von Wissel had approached the court seeking that it declares as unlawful the first respondent's decision to grant membership to the third respondent to conduct the operation of a Spar retail supermarket at the premises referred to as the George Hotel Site. In the alternative the applicant wants the court to review and set aside the decision by Spar of granting third respondent membership to operate a Spar retail supermarket at the disputed site. In their last prayer, LC Von Wissel wants the court to halt the commencement of the operation of a Spar Supermarket on the said site pending determination of this matter.

Appearing for Buy 'n Save on the matter was

Lawyer Sabela Dlamini of Magagula Hlophe Attorneys, who asked the witness Hans what exactly made him feel like this about the Mansoors. In his reply, Hans said his dealings with them and what others had said about them made him say these allegations. He added that they also did business in the dark corners and alley ways. In a nutshell, Dlamini highlighted to Steffens that his accusations and animosity were based on a meeting that was held with the Mansoors in 2010 at Moneni's Café 1896 where a so called "gentleman's agreement" was made. Steffens also mentioned that he had never dealt with the Mansoor's again after the above meeting because he did not trust them. Dlamini asked him if he had not called the Mansoors years later, to offer them to buy his Nkonyeni store, which the Mansoors rejected. He said he did.

"But why would you want to do business with them if you do not trust them?" Dlamini asked.

It could not be accurately ascertained from the witness as to why he wanted to do business with them when he felt so bad about them. Steffens admitted to the court that the Moneni store had not been doing well, despite that it was mentioned that it took three years for a store to break even when it had just opened. On Tuesday the court was told there were continuous losses in the business of Moneni. The respondents' attorneys led the court to the effect that the applicant's going concern was probably insolvent. This was after the applicant's key witness Willem Synman told the court that if the Spar at the George Hotel site was allowed to operate it would affect the Moneni Spar and might cause the store to suffer losses affecting its sustainability. SC Harper instructed by Spar Group, put it to the witness that the store had in fact run itself down to the loss without any competition as the new shop had not started operating in the disputed site. It transpired during the cross examination of the witness that the financials of the Moneni store reflected a continuous loss since inception in 2012. It was heard that in 2014, the store liabilities exceeded its assets and that the excess liabilities were increasing year by year. It was heard that Moneni Spar has been a failure for its entire fiveyear period of operation and that this happened without any competition. It was revealed that the applicant's business was currently indebted to a sum of almost E77 million, suggesting a state of insolvency submitted Spar counsel. The applicant disputed and refuted allegations that Moneni was insolvent, stating they may have been problems in the manner in which Spar and Moneni operated, which might have also contributed to its failure.

Below are some of the cited problems: MATATA ROBBERY

The applicant's witness led the court in evidence to the effect that there were a couple of robberies that took place, which also impacted on the figures, affecting their future projections. However, the witness insisted to the court that the Matata Group remained with a cash flow despite the robberies and that the January 2016 robbery affected them the most. The respondents' attorneys contended to the court as to why the loss figures resulting from the robberies were not reflected in the audited financial statements and the applicant replied they were written off as bad debts hence they did not appear.

SRA WOES

It transpired during trial that the applicant owed

E44 million in taxes. They explained to the court that this was as a result of failure to remit VAT taxes to SRA between the years 2011 and 2012 and that a portion of the money in the sum of E11 million was merely tax liability. The marathon case, which commenced in 2016, has been through court many times and the last being January 2017 until this past week. LC Von Wissel has so far led three witnesses to advance its case and the trial is scheduled to continue in August 2017.

ANC distances itself from armed protesters

Maimane under fire for donning bulletproof

Democratic Alliance leader Mmusi Maimane is taking flak on social media for wearing a bullet-proof vest during anti-Jacob Zuma marches in Johannesburg yesterday.

Pictures of the vest, which he wore underneath his T-shirt, surfaced on social media and were quickly shared, igniting a fierce debate.

DA national spokesman Phumzile van Damme confirmed that Maimane had received threats, but did not want to be drawn into details about them.

She told TMG Digital that the vest was part of "security assessments and purely a precautionary measure".

"Yes, the DA leader had a bul-

let-proof vest on. It was a precautionary measure given the security analysis provided," she said yesterday afternoon.

Van Damme said the DA march was peaceful and "a beautiful expression of unity in diversity. We are proud of South Africans today". In response to the questions about the vest, Maimane told reporters outside the Union Buildings in Pretoria; "I am the father of two kids, a husband to one wife.

It would be irresponsible of me knowing that people have threatened my life, not to take all the precautions I can take."

Protesters chant 'Zuma must go' outside Gupta compound

OHANNESBURG -About 300 people congregated outside the Gupta family compound in Saxonwold, Johannesburg, at noon yesterday as part of "Black Friday" protests countrywide calling for President Jacob Zuma to leave as president of the country.

What was supposed to be a silent protest turned into sloganeering as the crowd chanted "Zuma must go". Two Johannesburg Metropolitan Police Department (JMPD) vehicles were stationed at the entrance to the compound to keep an eye at the protest.

There is a belief that the family has captured the state for its own business successes. Some of the placards carried by the crowd said "Zuma is failing", "Unite South Africa", "ZUMA, COMMANDER AND THIEF", "To hell with destructive engagement Zuma must go" and "honour Madiba."

The Gupta family, which consists of brother Atul, Ajay and Rajesh, are friends of Zuma and have business dealings with his son Duduzane.

'Stay positive,' Treasury tells South Africans

OHANNESBURG -Describing it as a "setback", the National Treasury yesterday nevertheless asked the country to remain positive in its commentary on the Fitch Ratings downgrade, the second after S& P Global.

"The announcement by Fitch is noted by government and while it is a setback, government remains committed to making sure that its work with business, labour and the civil society continues in order to improve the business confidence and implement structural reforms to accelerate inclusive economic growth," the Treasury said in a statement. "This downgrade reflects Fitch's view that recent political events, including a major cabinet reshuffle, will weaken standards of governance and public finances. In the agency's view, the Cabinet reshuffle is likely to result in a change in the direction of economic policy, to undermine progress in n state-owned companies' governance, raising the risk that the contingent liabilities associated with these entities are realised and increase the prospect of a substantial increased issuance of guarantees in respect of a nuclear build programme. News24

APE TOWN -Hundreds of DA supporters, some draped in the South African flag, were making their way to the starting point of their anti-Zuma march in Johannesburg yesterday.

"Today we are going to march for change," said Tebello Mokoena, a DA councillor, at the Westgate Transport Centre.

Mokoena said the party was marching to say "Zuma must go".

SCHOOL GRANTEE IN FAL WITH TEACHER

...Lover, a teacher in mission school, alleges grantee who is also a reverend, forced her to commit abortion after suspecting she was pregnant having vomited morning-after-pills administered to her by him

n an illicit love affair gone sour, an alleged lover to a mission school grantee, who is a teacher by profession in the same school the grantee manages, has claimed that her former lover coerced her to commit abortion after suspecting she was pregnant.

This came after the same grantee had prescribed and administered morning-after-pills to the woman, but she vomited them as soon as she

This was after the man of the cloth, who manages one of the mission schools in the Hhohho region and also preaches the Word of God in the local church, had allegedly engaged in several unprotected sexual encounters with his lover. The teacher is now screaming victimisation as she feels her former lover is no longer treating her fairly after she questioned his decision to force her to commit abortion yet they are both Christians and should not do such.

The grantee and his teacher lover will not be named for now as nothing formal has been reported by the aggrieved party to the mission's authorities for steps to be taken although the teacher has threatened to take the matter up with the relevant authorities.

She disclosed that in countless incidents, the lover would hope into their love nest at the teachers' quarters unnoticed at night at around 8pm and skillfully leave in the wee hours of the morning when it was still dark.

"It was good while it lasted, but now I regret ever falling for him. I am no longer comfortable at this school as I'm being victimised by my former lover.

As we speak, he all of a sudden wants me to pay rent for using a house belonging to the school and is using his powers as the school grantee. As for the situation of the abortion, I felt uncomfortable acceding to his demands as I am a Christian and it also surprised me that such a demand came from another Christian - a reverend for that matter. Fortunately, I then discovered that I was not pregnant after all," alleged


The teacher also shared with the Observer on Saturday a number of SMSes sent by the grantee to her when he was trying to convince her to commit the abortion.

She then warned other women against falling to the temptation of being engaged in illicit relationships because they never end well and one is bound to get hurt.

Depression is preventable, treatable -WHO's Dr Mengestu

r Tigest Ketsela Mengestu, the country Representative of the World Health Organisation (WHO) has urged the nation to talk about depression for better understanding and to break down stigma that hinders access and support for people living with depression.

Mengestu revealed that depression constitutes a major global public health concern and has now been recognised as one of the leading causes of disability globally.

The WHO country representative said at least 320 million people world-wide and 30 million people in Africa live with this debilitating condition, which is also a major contributor to suicides. Mengestu said it is estimated globally that one million people take their own lives each year, which translates to 120 suicide deaths every hour on aver-

She also said it is sad to note that for every person who commits suicide, there are 20 more that make an attempt.

Statistics

"We should always bear in mind that there are faces and real people behind these statistics," emphasised Mengestu.

"The effects of depression as we all know have a multiplier effect as they go beyond the person suffering from the condition to impact on their loved ones, family and friends. Untreated depression can prevent people from working and participating in family and community life.

Depression affects socioeconomic development yet most of us are still in denial. Thus, depression remains hidden, not treated and not talked about."

She also revealed the good news that depression is preventable and treatable. She said avoiding stressful situations; alcohol abuse and drug use as well as maintaining a proper diet and physical activity can improve wellbeing and inevitably prevent depres-

She further said with proper treatment, care and support people can fully recover from depression.

"However, the sad news is that most people with this condition, who are in need of treatment, care and support, do not receive them.

In some countries, this can be up to 90 per cent of people in need.

On this World Health Day, therefore, we are called into action as government sectors, international development partners, non-governmental organisations, faith based organisations, civil society in general, communities and individuals to work together to ensure that everyone is better informed about depression, its causes and possible consequences, including suicide. and what help is or can be available for the prevention and treatment of depression," she added.

Support

greater support, stating; "let us strengthen our community engagement and social mobilisation programmes to ensure proper public education and awareness building regarding depression, clearing misunderstandings, and breaking down stigma and discrimination which hinder access to needed care and support. Let's ensure provision of community care and treatment for depression in pri-

mary care settings by trained general health personnel as fundamental steps towards easier access to care for a large number of people. We also need to ensure uninterrupted availability of essential medicines for treating depression at all levels of health care systems. We need to strengthen is human resources for health, in terms of increasing training and retention of mental health professionals with skills for the management of depression. Let's also strengthen partnerships, involvement and collaborative efforts across all key stakeholders. Mental disorders, including depression, are very complex and cannot be addressed by the ministry of health alone, or by the health sector alone.

Other sectors such as education, public service and others should be involved and join arms in addressing mental health issues," she said.

Mengestu also assured that WHO will continue working Mengestu also called for with health care leaders to create options for managing and treating mental health conditions, including depression. She said through its Mental Health Gap Action Programme (MHGAP) and the Global Mental Health Action Plan (2013-2020), WHO and partners are supporting people affected by depression. She said every country should have programmes and strategies in place to help people with national health challenges.







Strange auditors surface at Matsapha prison canteen

ollowing allegations of looting canteen monies at His Majesty's Correctional Services, arbitrary promotions, nepotism and corrupt practices, a can of worms has spilled once more.

Officers have called the Observer on Saturday seeking to reveal more dirt within the department. As early as Monday, officers called to disclose that following the ground breaking story in a rare occurrence, auditors were seen at the canteen meaning they might have been contracted over the weekend after the story.

However the million dollar question is who could have called in the audit firm to look into the books of accounts of the club without its members sanctioning same.

The question was posed to Public Relations Officer Bongani Khumalo on whether there was a committee or a board that ran the canteens and under pressure he said there was a board indeed in place. However, when he was asked to share the names of the board members along with their contact details, he failed to reveal them.

Question

The commissioner general had since told this publication that information was within the archives of the Swazi Observer. When the journalist adequately familiarised himself with past reports on the canteen, the question of ownership was never answered.

The question was also posed to the PRO following the audit of the canteen, with a view to understand on whose mandate was the audit team doing the audit of the canteens, why were there no monthly reconciliation statements to provide an understanding of how much the canteens made per month and where such money was

Khumalo stopped taking calls from this publication in almost all the numbers available. A text message was

also sent to get clarity on the presence of auditors at the Correctional Services.

The audit firm was also contacted on who had hired them to audit a govemment institution without being given authority by any government official.

Transactions

An audit is an objective examination and evaluation of the financial statements of an organisation to make sure that the records are a fair and accurate representation of the transactions they claim to represent. It can be done internally by employees of the organisation, or externally by an outside

The senior partner of the audit firm said they had been contracted by the Correctional Services.

The senior partner alleged the canteens were different from the shops within the Correctional Services.

He said he knew about this because he had been doing the audit to other areas and he would be presenting his report in three weeks.

The senior partner contradicted himself when he said he had been doing the audit yet he had said the letter of appointment was given to him last week when he met the correctional top brass.

He said he had a letter of engagement from the commissioner general but also failed to answer on whose authority was he assigned to audit a staff club without the knowledge of the members

Exposed

The audit firm is seen as a ploy by officers to cook books and cover up vital information including the shenanigans that were exposed by the Observer on Saturday.

The law firm also disclosed information that they were appointed based on a sterling job they had done previously with the correctional depart-

The senior partner pleaded with the journalist not to prejudge the outcome of the audit as they had an audit plan that would reveal everything if there was a need for a forensic audit that

would be recommended.

However, the partner failed to give a clear answer on why a government institution was audited by a private company. The senior partner could only say "it's too early to judge the outcome of the audit" disregarding the question of auditing a government institution.

The issue of nepotism that was strongly refuted by the commissioner general during an interview after it had been revealed that an officer who has been currently heading the Dog Unit was another typical example of nepotism in the department.

The officer is alleged to have been recruited from the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) at a junior position and quickly elevated to a senior position.

Government has so many properties and assets, the ownership is always clear that they belong to the government of Swaziland.

However, it was not the case with the herd of dairy cattle at the Big Bend Prison. The dairy cattle are registered under the name of an individual, we can reveal.

Information also unexplained movement of two dairy cattle from Big Bend to Luyengweni dip tank. The PR Bongani Khumalo did not respond our calls.

Confirmed

We visited some farms and land in various chiefdoms in the Lubombo, Shiselweni and Manzini regions whose owner confirmed to be an official at the Corrections.

Some of the farms and land either had structures or land prepared and levelled for building, some had a number of cattle and one of the farms on the perimeters of Matsapha, towards Power Station 44, a herd of cattle was spotted being taken for meadow land (grazing) and they were confirmed to belong to the top official.

The commissioner general, on his part, told the journalist he bought cattle everywhere and that he also bought from people to help them as som approached him when they needed money desperately.

However, the number of properties and cattle the commissioner general owns was shocking for a government employee.

Officers who have been flooding the Observer on Saturday with the allegations want the commissioner general subjected to a life stlye audit.

Depression on the rise amongst Swazis

he country's analysis on depression is damming and lack of legislation for tackling depression is a course for concern to Dr. Violet Mwanjani.

The National Psychiatric Centre from January to December 2016 saw 381 females and 149 clients visiting for the first time. A shocking 3 529 females and 1 244 males are on the list of follow up clients with the cen-

The doctor also revealed a shocking number of males committing suicide which show men lacked coping mechanisms than women. The data revealed by Dr Violet Mwanjani showed 102 males and 23 females committing suicide from January to December 2017.

The doctor presenting at the Happy

Valley Hotel on World Health Organisation day revealed the country despite the alarming high number of patients visiting the Psychiatric Centre, the country has never attempted to make a study on the subject of depression.

Dr Violet said, "depression is a mood disorder which causes negative changes in feelings, thinking and behaviour, It is different from usual mood fluctuations with short-lived emotional responses to challenges in everyday life.

It affects people of all ages, from all walks of life with no geographical boundaries, It is very common and affects 121 million people worldwide (WHO 2012).'

Estimates of the prevalence of depressive disorders depends on patient population and method of ascertainment. The doctor also revealed a two plan solution for the challenges of depression in the country.

The doctor said individuals and care takers should understand that "there's no single and direct way to prevent depression but taking steps to control stress, is important. Friendship and social support, especially in times of crisis is crucial. Seek professional help as soon as possible because, treatment at the earliest signs of a problem can help prevent depression from worsening"

The other aspect of her plan was to policy and decision makers saying those at higher level should ensure availability of a mental health programme, good and up to date guiding documents; mental health policy, strategic plans, psychiatric treatment guidelines, training manuals, Mental Health Act etc.

The doctor further pleaded for ade-

quate qualified mental health human resources, uninterrupted supply of medicines & medical equipment, decentralisation of mental health services to the grassroots and avail funds for awareness campaigns and train-Dr Violet also revealed on man-

agement of depression that it can be treated and cured completely with medications and Psychot selling.

Complications of untreated or poorly managed depression without intervention, symptoms of depression could last for weeks, months and even years.

She also said depression prevent people from conducting nor-

n its arguments over the opposing of bail for armed robbery suspects who allegedly terrorised the Shiselweni region, the crown stated Shiselweni folk would lose faith in the country's justice system.

Crown Counsel Beauty Fakudze

had submitted before High Court Judge Robert Magagula that if the three suspects were admitted to bail they would again cause a reign of terror and commit more crimes and the people of that region would lose faith in the justice system.

The three, Andile Vilakati, Thabani Nxumalo and Siphamandla Shabangu are facing a total of 14 counts ranging from armed robbery to house breaking and theft.

Attacked

They allegedly attacked Cynthia Mkhatiwa armed with knives at her homestead, robbed her of her valuables and further robbed her of a 12 bore shot gun, which they in turn used in committing the rest of the crime they have been charged with as they



allegedly robbed shops and people.

The three were arrested by the Siphofaneni police after being sought by the Nhlangano Serious Crimes Unit for the alleged offences. As part

of the ground of opposing bail, the crown further furnished the court with previous criminal records which indicated that some of them were involved in the robberies.

Moza man kills countryman after drinking spree

Mozambican man has been indicted at the High Court for killing his fellow countryman after a drinking spree in Manzini.

Mario Zavale of Madonsa allegedly killed his country man January Muthuki by planting a knife on his neck killing him instantly.

According to the indictment Zavale is said to have killed his country man while at Madonsa, an incident that happened in July 2016.

Celumusa Mgwahlaza also of the same area who has been cited as the first witness in the murder case, will according to the indictment, tell the court that he was invited by Michael Zandamela and the deceased to come to their place for a drinking spree in the evening of the fateful day.

He will further state that he found Zavale and one Duduzile Maziya and started drinking until 10pm. After that drinking session ended they decided to go to Zavale's place where they continued enjoying more drinks.

Drinks

Howeve, while still enjoying their drinks, they heard a knock at the door and Zavale asked who the person at the door was and it turned out to be the deceased.

Zavale refused to open the door but the deceased who had also been drinking forced his way in by forcing the door open and told Zavale that umjwayela kabi.

Zavale then took an iron rod and assaulted the deceased on the head whilst Mgwahlaza was trying to separate them but failing and that was when Zavale entered his house, grabbed an okapi knife and planted it on the deceased's neck killing him instantly.

The witness tried to assist the bleeding deceased but it was already late as he had died and he then called the police who arrived at the scene.

Zavale was subsequently arrested and charged with mur-

Greece agrees on reforms to unlock bailout cash

ALLETTA - Greece agreed on a fresh set of reforms with its eurozone creditors yesterday with hopes that Athens could unlock bailout cash in time to avert a debt default just months away.

Eurozone finance ministers meeting in the Maltese capital of Valletta said Athens agreed on principle to the new reforms and technical teams would visit Greece as soon as possible to seal the deal.

"The big blocks have now been sorted out and now we just have the final stretch," Eurogroup Head Jeroen Dijsselbloem said after the talks.

Heavily-indebted Athens and the EU and IMF which handle the bailout had been deadlocked over reforms for months amid disagreements on debt relief and budget targets.

The deal is needed in order to stop the country from defaulting on its creditors as early as July when Athens owes about seven billion euros (\$7.4 billion) in debt repayments.

Dijsselbloem said the Greek government was now prepared to reduce pensions in 2019 and lower tax breaks in 2020 in return for a bailout payment

Greek Finance Minister Euclid Tsakalotos said the commitments would pass through Parliament as soon as possible, though the gamble depends on his Syriza party's razor-thin majority.


Tsakalotos said his eurozone counterparts had also accepted that Greece boosted social spending if budget targets were met and that debt relief would also come back to the table.

"We will be ready for all the

despite widespread public oppo- pieces of the puzzle to fit in for the discussion on debt," said Tsakalotos, for whom debt relief is a key demand.

"I think we will have (a solution) well before summer," he added. The eurozone is under big pressure to end the feud in order to avert inflicting damage to a stalling Greek recovery. Despite projections for growth, the Greek economy actually stalled in 2016 and recent data shows that after some stabilisation, it has begun to falter again amid uncertainty triggered by the row. mbattled Swazi TV News Editor Nkosinathi Dlamini has instructed his lawyer to request the court to proceed with the criminal trial to the end before reverting to a peace binding hearing as proposed by Magistrate Lucia Lukhele.

He was to return to court on Wednesday. Dlamini feels his image is at stake already after he had been portrayed in the duration of the hearing as some irresponsible personality who had to be dragged to court.

His discontentment is that he was the first to report the assault by his wife Lungile, who only laid counter assault charges the following day of November 23, 2016 but her complaint was

the only one first acted on by the police.

He also told his lawyer Sipho Gumedze that he feels now it appears evidence is turning against the complainant in his case, as the prosecution wants to turn things round by abandoning the criminal case against him and jumping to that of peace binding; something they should have done in the first instance when he reported, especially now that they are

claiming to be looking into the interests of chil-

Dlamini also says he had to bare his body in court to demonstrate the extent of injuries inflicted on him by his wife for all to see and all that would go to waste if he would agree to the prosecution's sudden turnaround.

Dlamini had pleaded not guilty on Wednesday March 8 when the matter appeared before the magistrate at the Sigodyweni police.

During the cross examination, the magistrate became concerned that in the midst of it all there were children born of the relationship between Nkosinatsi and Lungile, whose rights could be

compromised if the evidence continued to trickle in court.

The magistrate then called both prosecution and defence to her bench where she expressed her misgivings that the evidence could not be helpful to the children of the married couple. That led to the adjournment of the case to Wednesday while considerations on the peace binding route were to be pondered.

However, Nkosinatsi says the peace binding option had been made available early in the clash with his wife but was turned down even at family consultations level until the final assault on his body in which he suffered multiple injuries on his shoulders where he was allegedly bitten by his wife while he slept in bed.

On the night of November 23, shortly after

Nkosinatsi says he was attacked by his wife, he went to report to the Sigodvweni Police Station. He was even given the medical report form by the police, the RSP88 which was presented as evidence in court. This form he took to Mkhiwa Private Clinic in Manzini where he was treated and discharged.

It had become apparent at the hearing that Lungile had little or noth-

ing to produce in court as proof that she was attacked by her husband, proof in the form of sustained injuries, save that she claimed she was slapped several times.

Police also came under the wrath of the magistrate for mishandling the processes in that while Nkosinatsi was first to report the criminal assault, his case was shelved but instead that of his wife was given precedence even though she only came to report that she was assaulted the following day, nearly 12 hours after the incident. The magistrate was further concerned that the couple could be 'extremely estranged' if the matter was to continue in that fashion.

Kobolondo to beneficiate lold to 99.9% nurit

fter the construction of a Central Gold Processing Plant and Gold Refinery in the country, Kobolondo Mining, within the 20-year rehabilitation process of the Bulembu Chrysotile Dump, will beneficiate gold to 99.9% in the country.

This refers to all gold mined in the country and the one that will be extracted from the Havelock Chrysotile Dump at Bulembu.

The company's officials this week clarified that Kobolondo Mining, as a condition of the mining lease granted to the company, will complete feasibility for the construction of a Central Gold Processing Plant and Gold Refinery in the country.

"These facilities would ensure all gold produced and mined in Swaziland, in addition to gold extracted from the Havelock Chrysotile Dump within the 20-year rehabilitation process, will be fully beneficiated to 99.9% purity in Swaziland.

"This is in accordance with the objectives of His Majesty's 2022 Vision. This Central Gold Processing would unlock the enormous gold mineral value of Swaziland by allowing gold miners to have their gold concentrates beneficiated in Swaziland," read a statement by the company that has since been granted lease to rehabilitate the asbestos remains at Bulembu.

It has been explained that the rehabilitation project will also extract a range of base metals from the chrysotile tailings, making use of sulphuric acid which will be a by-product of the gold beneficiation process.

This process is called leaching and will generate a magnesium sulphate.

It is this product that will need to be exported because the beneficiation of the magnesium sulphate into magnesium metal (the final end product) requires a massive smelter and base metal refinery.

Investment

These facilities will require substantial investment and is limited by the high price of power from ESKOM and the insufficient economies of scale. Therefore, the beneficiation of these base metals in Swaziland is currently seen as not economically viable for the country.

"It is imperative to note that this is first and

foremost a rehabilitation project. The process of extracting the base metals from the Chrysotile tailings (dump) destroys the chemical composition of the remaining asbestos, leaving a safe and inert silica sand afterwards.

"The project, therefore, achieves three objectives, which is the tailings dump is rehabilitated; the Central Gold Processing Facility and Refinery will provide the platform for the reemergence of the Swazi gold mining industry; and the extraction of the base metal concentrate will generate revenues and foreign exchange for Swaziland," further read the statement.

362 jobs at stake in Crooks Plantations, **SRA** battle

t least 362 employees at Crooks Plantations stand to lose their jobs, should the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) collect a sum of E9 million from the sugar cane. citrus fruits farming company.

In fear that the company may shut down, it has ran to the High Court where its directors have filed an urgent application seeking an order to have SRA stay the collections of the money in respect of tax.

According to Crooks Plantations in its papers, they are seeking an order directing the Commissioner General Dumisani Masilela to set off in respect of tax liabilities of Value Added Tax (VAT) assessments in the sum of E9 032 321.12 against the VAT refund payable to the company in the sum of E1 114 568.7.

The commissioner general has been cited as the first respondent while the SRA has been cited as the second respondent in the matter which was before the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala yesterday.

According to Kelvin William Gowran of the company, Crooks was actually in VAT credit position of E155 000. Making his brief submissions before the chief justice, lawyer Kenneth Simelane, who is representing the sugar cane company, applied that the order to have SRA stay the collection, be granted to his client.

He submitted that since this is a harvesting season, the company can be largely affected as it may shut down, a situation that may also see employees losing their jobs.

The matter was postponed to Thursday as it will be placed in the contested roll before another judge.

SD IS WORLD'S FOURTH

waziland has been ranked the fourth least healthy country in the world.

This is according to 24/7 Wall St which stated that many factors contribute to the health of a population, and worldwide health varies to the extreme. While most Americans are aware that these global health disparities exist, a look at the health outcomes of each country's population reveals the extent of these massive health differences.

In the United States, which has its own well-documented health issues, the average person born today can expect to live to be about 79 years old. In the Southern African nation of Swazilland, life expectancy is three decades shorter. It should be noted that the US ranks behind 30 other nations in longevity.

Although it is certainly important, the quality of a country's health care system is not the only factor contributing to the health of a population. Poverty, the regional presence of disease, and health behaviours all help determine both quality and length of life. Reviewing health factors such as life expectancy, maternal and infant mortality rates, and the incidence of tuberculosis, 24/7 Wall St. identified the healthiest and least healthy countries. Based on their analysis, Iceland is the healthiest nation, while the Southern African nation of Lesotho ranks as the least healthy.


The relative affluence of a region can have wide-reaching implications on the health of its populace. Extremely poor populations are more likely to live in conditions that put them at greater risk of illness. They are less likely to be able to afford proper nourishment, and more likely to experience stress, which can affect health as well.

Those with little or no disposable income are also much less likely to be able to afford proper health treatment. On a national level, governments and private health enterprises with fewer resources are less likely to be able to provide needed treatment.

Greater health spending is by no means a guarantee of better health outcomes. For example, health spending per capita in the United States is higher than nearly any nation on Earth, but US health ranks behind dozens of nations on this list. However, there appears to be a minimum threshold of health spending necessary to maintain adequate public wellness. The world's healthiest nations tend to spend more on health than others, and in many of the least healthy nations, spending amounts to a tiny fraction of that in the most developed countries.

In each of the 10 healthiest nations, spending ranges from at least US\$1 610 per person to US\$9 674 per

...Chief among the many factors contributing to the nation's poor health is the HIV/AIDS epidemic and TB



person. Among the least healthy nations, health spending ranges from US\$570 per person in South Africa to just US\$15.60 per person in the Central African Republic.

The relationship between spending and health outcomes likely points not to prices of care, but to access and use of treatment. It is probably no coincidence that many of the healthiest nations have some form of government subsidised or wholly-funded health care. In Iceland, not only is health care provided by the government, but registration with a general practitioner is compulsory, which contributes to residents' access to care and increases preventive practices.

One of the major differences between the healthiest and least healthy nations is the presence of preventable illnesses. While tuberculosis, a treatable illness with an existing vaccine, has been effectively eliminated as a threat in most industrialised countries, it remains a serious problem in developing nations. TB's widespread presence in these nations points to an unsophisticated or inadequate health infrastructure, with minimal vaccination

In the United States, there are just 3.2 new reported cases of TB per 100 000 residents annually. In South Africa, one of the least healthy nations, there are 834 new report-

ed cases each year per 100 000 people. In Swaziland, TB leads to seven per cent of all deaths, making it the third leading cause of death in the country.

While TB is a serious problem in many of the nations on this list, Americans are likely more familiar with another deadly illness, HIV/AIDS. While infection rates of the blood-borne virus have slowly subsided in the United States, the disease continues to decimate large segments of Africa, particularly in Southern Africa, where four of the 10 least healthy nations—Lesotho, Swaziland, South Africa, and Mozambique—are located. In Swaziland, nearly 30% of the population lives with the virus.

Below is how the least healthy countries have been ranked:

10. LIBERIA

Life expectancy: 60.8

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 52.8

Health expenditure per capita: US\$46 GDP per capita: US\$875

Still recovering from a bloody and destructive civil war in the 1990s, Liberia today lacks many of the infrastructural elements necessary for good public health. Less than 10% of the population has access to electricity, and roughly one in every four residents lacks access to sanitised water. Such poor access to basic necessities likely heavily contributes to Liberia's poor health outcomes, which are some of the worst on the planet. The infant mortality rate in

Liberia, at 53 deaths for every 1 000 births, is one of the highest of any country. While the maternal mortality rate in many advanced countries is less than five maternal deaths per 100 000 live births, in Liberia an average of 725 women die per 100 000 births — nearly the highest rate of any country.

9. SOUTH AFRICA Life expectancy: 57.2

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 33.6

Health expenditure per capita: US\$570

GDP per capita: US\$13 209

Tuberculosis, a potentially deadly disease primarily affecting young adults—common in impoverished countries—is a major problem in South Africa. There are 834 new incidents of tuberculosis for every 100 000 people annually, the highest TB rate of any country considered.

The country also faces a serious HIV problem. Nearly one in every five South Africans between the ages of 15 and 49 are HIV positive, one of the highest such shares in the world. A lack of education surrounding the disease may be partially to blame. The country's President, Jacob Zuma, infamously claimed he once showered after having sex with an HIV positive woman to reduce the likelihood of being infected.

8. COTE D'IVOIRE Life expectancy: 51.6

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 66.6

Health expenditure per capita: US\$88 GDP per capita: US\$3 359

While there was relative peace in Ivory Coast for several decades after the country gained independence from France in 1960, a military rebellion in 2002 ignited a period of violence and instability that left thousands dead and much of the nation's infrastructure in disrepair. Just 56% of the Ivory Coast population today has access to electricity, and nearly one in five residents lack access to sanitised water. The average life expectancy at birth in the country of just 52 years is nearly the lowest in the world and 27 years less than the US life expectancy of about 79 years.

7. MOZAMBIQUE

Life expectancy: 55.0

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 56.7

Health expenditure per capita: US\$42 GDP per capita: US\$1 192

Many Mozambicans lack access to basic infrastructure that people in healthier countries take for granted. Only about half of the country's population has access to clean water, and only 20% have access to electricity. Such access is even scarcer in the country's rural areas. Lack of access to modern amenities likely contributes to the country's low 55-year life expectancy.

Like many unhealthy countries, health spending in Mozambique is relatively low. Combined annual public and private health care expenditure amounts to only about US\$42 per capita. In comparison, annual US health care spending tops US\$9 400. Low investment in health care is partially the consequence of weak economic conditions. The country's official unemployment rate of 22.6% is among the worst in the world.

6. GUINEA-BISSAU

Life expectancy: 55.2

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 60.3

Health expenditure per capita: US\$37 GDP per capita: US\$1 511

Childbirth is far riskier for both mothers and infants in Guinea-Bissau than it is in most other countries. Infants are over 10 times more likely to die within the first year of life in the West African nation than in the United States. Similarly, the maternal mortality rate during childbirth is nearly 40 times the US rate.

Progress, as measured by health outcomes, is likely hindered by inadequate infrastructure and education. For example, slightly more than half of the population of 1.8 million lives in rural areas, many of whom lack basic amenities. Only 60.3% of the country's rural residents have access to clean water, and 21.5% have access to electricity.

5. NIGERIA



Despite Nigeria's vast proven oil reserves—the second most of any country in Africa and the 10th most in the world—instability in the region has hindered foreign investment and limited economic development. Currently

the seventh most populous country, Nigeria is expanding at a rapid pace and is on track to be the third most populous in the world by 2050. With resources spread thin across the nation, just US\$118 spent on health care per Nigerian annually, approximately one per cent of the health care expenditure for the average American. The country's average life expectancy at birth is just 53 years, 26 years less than the US life expectancy.

4. SWAZILAND

LIFE EXPECTANCY: 48.9

GDP PER CAPITA: US\$9 712

The average person born in the Southern African monarchy of Swaziland today is expected to live to be just 48.9 years old, 30 years less than the average person born in the United States today. Chief among the many factors contributing to the nation's poor health is the AIDS epidemic. According to UNICEF, Swaziland has the highest recorded incidence rate of HIV on Earth. The World Bank estimates that a staggering 28.8% of the population aged 15-49 is afflicted with the virus.

HIV/AIDS is not the only deadly disease presenting a national health crisis in Swaziland. The country has nearly the highest annual incidence rate of tuberculosis. Approximately seven per cent of deaths are due to TB, making it the third leading cause of death in the country.

3. SIERRA LEONE

Life expectancy: 50.9

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 87.1

Health expenditure per capita: US\$86 GDP per capita: US\$1 593

Indicative of poor overall health and health care facilities, child birth is significantly more deadly in Sierra Leone than anywhere else in the world. Some 1 360 mothers die during childbirth for every 100 000 live births each year, by far the worst maternal mortality rate of any country considered. Not surprisingly, life expectancy is also extremely low. At birth, the typical Sierra Leone resident is expected to live only 50.9 years.

Sierra Leone resembles most other unhealthy countries in several measures. Slightly more than 60% of the country's 6.3 million residents live in rural areas, and many lack basic amenities. Only 47.8% of the nation's rural population has access to clean water, and almost none have access to electricity.

2. CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC

Life expectancy: 50.7

Infant mortality rate (per 1 000 live births): 91.5

Health expenditure per capita: US\$16 GDP per capita: US\$628

Infant and maternal mortality rates are often used as proxies for both the health of the population and the quality of the health system. In Central African Republic, about 880 mothers die for every 100 000 live births, and roughly 90 children die before the age of one for every 1 000 live births — each nearly the highest rate in the world.

The country's poor health outcomes are also tied to conditions accompanying extreme poverty, such as the population's minimal access to medical treatment and healthy food. The nation's GDP per capita of US\$628 is one-89th the U.S GDP per capita. As might be expected, annual health spending in CAR is also extremely low, at just US\$16 per person. In dozens of nations, at least US\$1 000 is spent per person on health.

1. LESOTHO

Life expectancy: 49.7

Infant mortality rate (per 1000 live births): 69.2

Health expenditure per capita: US\$105

GDP per capita: US\$3 003

Lesotho is encompassed entirely by South Africa, another country with some of the worst health outcomes in the world. Like its neighbour, both TB and HIV are major problems in Lesotho. For every 100 000 people, there are 788 new cases of tuberculosis annually, and 22.7% of country residents aged 15-49 are HIV positive — each the second largest share of any country with available data. Some unhealthy behaviours vary considerably by gender. While only 0.4% of women smoke, slightly more than half of men do.

Like many unhealthy countries, Lesotho is primarily rural. Only 27.3% of the country's 1.9 million residents live in urban areas, which tend to have greater access to basic amenities like electricity and clean water.

as the healthiest country in the world. Iceland performs better than most nations in life expectancy, infant and maternal mortality, and incidence of diseases like tuberculosis

Like many of the healthiest nations, health spending is quite high in Iceland, with the equivalent of US\$4 662 per capita spent on health care. Iceland has a state-funded, universal health care system. Icelanders are also required by law to register with a physician, which may further increase the frequency with which residents receive preventative care.

Methodology

To determine the most and least healthy countries, 24/7 Wall St. reviewed infant mortality rates (per 1 000 live births), maternal mortality rates (per 100 000 live births), life expectancy at birth, and the incidence of tuberculosis - a widely-used approximation of disease incidence — in 170 countries from data published by the World Bank. "We normalised values using the min-max method and took the geometric mean to compare countries.

"Up-to-date health measures comparable globally are often very limited. We only considered data that was available for at least 75% of the countries on our list, and we excluded countries with fewer than 250 000 people. We used data for the most recent year available.

"In addition to health measures used in the ranking, we collected data on access to health services. We looked at the share of a country's population with access to clean water, clean air, and electricityall data came from the World Bank.

"We also reviewed per capita health expenditure by public and private sources, as well as adult literacy rates, unemployment rates, population counts, and smoking rates." All economic data came from the World Bank.

SIPATELLS CLEANERS: EMPLOYMENT ENDS APRIL 30

...ATUSWA intervenes, calls for emergency meeting last Tuesday in which parastatal was to justify why it was taking the work of the cleaners to give private companies



pril 30 is the final day at work for the 17 Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority cleaners based at the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre.

Amalgamated Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (ATUSWA) Secretary General Wonder Mkhonza, says on receipt of the letter from SIPA informing the union that they were rendering the workers redundant, retrenched or retired, they immediately wrote back the other week to demand clarification, more especially because the reaction came after the cleaners intimated that they would want their issues handled through their union. Mkhonza says the meeting was scheduled first for last week Friday but had to be rescheduled to last Tuesday to allow for the series of meetings the union has with the visiting International Labour Organisation team.

On the other hand, the cleaners say they wonder why management was now issuing letters to them coming from the board because all along the board had not been in existence in that it had not been involved until their grievances were reported to the minister and to Parliament, through Manzini South Member of Parliament Owen Nxumalo.

The board had also not been involved when then minister Gideon Dlamini promised to look into the grievances submitted by the cleaners but now resurfaces to say it owns the retrenchment exercise. They say it was the same board

that sent the Chief Executive Officer, Phumelele Dlamini, on special leave but she refused to honour the instruction saying she was hired by the prime minister, it is now baffling as to why the board can now turn around and give her instructions. "In the corporate governance of SIPA, the board of directors report to the CEO, which is unheard of the world over," say the workers.

The working environment has turned bitter at the Trade Centre, especially in the presence of an inspector of works who is alleged to be telling the workers in the face that they are on their way out 'ngoba vele niyahamba'. During the preparations for the trade fair opening, a company associated with the inspector suddenly emerged from nowhere to do work that is otherwise done by the cleaners. The

cleaners say when they arrived at Mavuso in 2014 the government trade exhibition facility was in shambles and they worked their back backwards to turn it around given the prospects of employment. They immediately made it viable for Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini's weeding to Joy Maziya and for the King's birthday celebrations of the same year over and above preparing the facility for the international trade fair but now their work is being given to companies owned by relatives of those in top management at SIPA.

At the SEDCO Pavilion, for instance, another company has already been contracted to do work otherwise that should have been done by the cleaners.

The company is painting the pavilion following that it housed burnt goods from Power Stores in downtown Manzini.

Mkhonza says the union is aware that the intended outsourcing is to give work to companies owned by those close to top management so they can benefit indirectly, an argument that will also be on the table for management to answer in trying to explain the reasons for the retrenchments, redundancy or outsourcing.

Meanwhile the cleaners in Manzini submitted 17 grievances to management while those in Mbabane also submitted 36 of their own; all complaining about the style of management and abuse of office from the top. It is feared that the sudden silence by the commerce minister on the plight of the workers, despite they having alerted him and he having promised to act on same when he sent then Principal Secretary JinnohNkambule to address them, all because he bears the same family name as the SIPA CEO.

Produce resolution giving CEO those powers, ATUSWA tells Board

malgamated Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (ATUSWA), before anything could be deliberated upon regarding the fate of the cleaners, wants the board to provide an authentic copy of the resolution taken by the SIPA Board of Directors instructing the chief executive officer to hire, fire and give direct instructions to cleaners at the Mavuso Trade Centre.

This comes after a series of failed attempts to realise talks between the union and SIPA representatives. Wonder Mkhonza, the Secretary General of the union, said they had met and agreed previously that the representatives at the talks would bring with them proof of an instruction from the board to the CEO giving her the mandate to take decisions unilaterally. However, for over a week, the proof has not been forthcoming until yesterday when the meeting was again shifted to Thursday and thereafter April 18.

"If there is no such resolution, then the process will have to collapse to revive only after the resolution is provided to us. It is only then that we can restart the process of negotiating on behalf of our members, the cleaners. We basically want to discuss why they take away the work of the cleaners to give it to others where they have vested interests, the idea is at least to force them to give the cleaners the tender instead of dismissing them. If they go ahead with their decisions to remove the cleaners, we shall have no option but to rush to court to stop them."

In 127 pages, single mothers could learn a thing or two from this book as the youngster said it was written with a single mother at the back of her mind.


Asked if she was raised by a single mother herself, Bandiswa laughed and said "well I was raised by both parents and I am the third in five children."

HONOURS INTERPOLIN

The National Commissioner of Police - Isaac Mmemo Magagula honoured an invitation from INTERPOL structures to attend an international Security Conference held in Abu Dhabi United Arab Emirates (UAE). When attending this three-day

Conference (March 28-30) for ministers, police chiefs, senior government officials and representatives from the private sector, the national commissioner was accompanied by the Head of Criminal Investigations in the Lubombo Region - Senior Superintendent Sikhumbuzo Fakudze and an officer from the Police Information and Communications Office - Inspector Mazwi Ndzimandze. The conference was co-sponsored by INTERPOL and the UAE government under the theme "Unity for Security - Responsibility for a Safer World". Its purpose was to facilitate the sharing of best practices among Law Enforcement Agencies and the Private Sector tackling Terrorism, Organised and Emerging Crimes and Cybercrime which are proving to be a major threat to global security.

In confronting these global threats, INTERPOL developed a five-year systematic project funded by the UAE government to the tune of \$50M to focus on crimes affecting vulnerable categories, global terrorism, cybercrime, vehicle crime and Illicit drug trade. The money will be staggered in \$10 million installments annually over the five-year strategy execution timeline.

During the meeting which was officially opened by the UAE Minister for Interior - His Highness Lieutenant

General Sheikh Saif bin Zayed Al Nahyan, participants noted that human trafficking and people smuggling continue to cause human suffering with women and children being abused and exploited at an alarming rate. These phenomena which are modern forms of slavery are perpetuated and perpetrated in a syndicated fashion across global jurisdictions through a maze of deception as victims are promised employment only to be turned into sex or labour slaves.In some cases, children are remotely exploited through the internet for online pornography to audiences across the world which can be damaging and polluting to young minds.

On global terrorism, case study of recent terrorism incidents in various countries around the world showing the ugly face of this form of criminality and the malicious loss of innocent life it results in were reviewed.

The meeting explored vehicle crimes

as the theft, trafficking and smuggling of motor vehicles across jurisdictions which has adverse effects on the economies of countries particularly on insurance companies. The observation was that vehicles are stolen, smuggled and trafficked for the furtherance of other organised crimes such as terrorism and robberies.

On cybercrime, the meeting noted that this was a worldwide phenomenon with devastating effects on the economies of all jurisdictions which takes place mainly through the manipulation and hacking of computer systems, taking advantage of the exponential explosion of the internet and other financial technologies that are used in the banking sector.

Also explored was illicit drug trade and trafficking which continue to be a major challenge for all countries. It was observed that proceeds from drug dealing were the life blood of organised crime cartels used in committing other forms of crime such as terrorism.

Participants resolved that to confront human trafficking and smuggling effectively, there was need to strengthen the intra-country legislative frameworks to deter perpetrators. Countries were urged to be more vigilant and circumspect to avoid being caught up in the web of criminality as either places of origin, transit and destination of trafficked humans. On terrorism, the most viable counter strategy identified was building strong intelligence to identify and monitor the movements of terrorist suspects.

To combat vehicle theft, an urgent need for a vibrant mechanism of motor vehicle profiling based on vehicle registration and owner verification was recommended. There was also emphasis on public education on measures to prevent vehicle theft such as the installation of tracker systems and anti-theft gadgets. On Cybercrime, countries were urged to have internal cybercrime interdiction strategies that would enable cooperation with other entities in the financial sector which will be based on trust and confidence. In combating drug dealing and trafficking, the resolution was to conduct joint operations to dismantle syndicates, arrest couriers and seize drugs.

Strategies identified as applicable in combating all the phenomena included the need for capacity building, information sharing, collaboration and cooperation between law enforcement and the private sector to facilitate the exchange of vital intelligence and expertise to combat these global threats.

During the sidelines of the Conference, the national commissioner had a private meeting with the UAE Minister for Presidential Affairs, His Highness Shaikh Mansour Bin Zayed Al Nahyan where they shared ideas on policing systems and models.

This was cognisant of the low crime rate in that country as a result of professional policing and crime prevention frameworks in place. His Highness extended an invitation to the national commissioner for future visits to the UAE where policing models could be discussed in greater

The Swazi delegation also met with INTERPOL officials who are experts in crimes affecting vulnerable categories to solicit support to combat this form of criminality which is proving to be a menace in Swaziland. Following these discussions, the INTERPOL officials pledged to avail their services to come to Swaziland to assess the extent of the problem as well as to craft a dedicated strategy to deal with the phenomenon. They further invited Royal Swaziland Police Service officers involved in dealing with cases affecting vulnerable categories to attend a regional workshop due to be held in Cape

The delegation from Swaziland further visited and held discussions with the Swaziland Ambassador to the UAE - Prince Gcina who undertook to follow-up on the discussions held by the national commissioner and the minister for presidential affairs.

he Taiwan Medical Mission in Swaziland continues intervening in the breaking of the clutches of poverty that prevents disadvantaged communities from accessing proper and timely health care around the country.

At least 500 residents from this area received treatment from a total of seven medical practitioners, who dedicated the entire day of last Saturday to take care of this needy community.

This was a combined service of medical outreach and donation of food parcels as the Mtsambama people's day started with them receiving food and clothing from Tex-Ray Charity under the Tex-Ray Group in the country. This took place at the Salem Primary School under Mtsambama Inkhundla and Tex-

The organisers of the event included the Taiwan Medical Mission, Tex-Ray Group, Taipei Medical University Hospital and the Taiwan foreign mission in the country.

The medical specialists in the checkups concentrated on, amongst others body weight, body height, blood sugar, BP, and physical check-up. On the consultation aspect there were three specialists of general surgery, internal medicine, orthopedics, neurosurgery, allergy-immunology-rheumatology, and five general practitioners.

The team of doctors was made up of the Mission's Chief Dr Tu Chi- Cheng (Neurosurgeon), the Deputy Chief Dr Liao Say- Tsung (Rheumatologist),

Shih Neng-Chuan (Orthopedic) as well as Chen Kuan, Chiu Hsu Huai, Chang Sheng-Jie and Chen Po-Jui, who are all medical officers. The team was completed by volunteers from the Taiwan Technical Mission and Amitofo Care Centre (ACC).

Republic of China on Taiwan Embassy Minister Counsellor Liang reiterated his country's stance in continuously assisting the disabled, elderly and needy through their various missions in the country. "Taiwan is honoured to be Swaziland's development partner," he said briefly.

Mpolonjeni receives E257 187 sorghum mill

sorghum mill that will benefit about 120 farmers associations has been handed over to Mpolonjeni Constituency where the mill will be based.

The mill will benefit many farmers as it's an initiative for sorghum farmers and is most likely the sorghum beneficiaries will be constituencies as far as Lugongolweni, Matsanjeni North and Lomahasha.

The mill will help the community as it simultaneously processes sorghum and mealie-meal. The mill will, therefore, benefit farmers mostly engage in farming mainly for commercial purposes.

The sorghum mill was acquired through assistance of COSPE Swaziland to help the communities in processing their harvest.

The project is as a result of the support from the Taiwanese Technical Mission which initiated a process of promoting sorghum as a drought tolerant crop suitable for the Lubombo suitable markets. region.

At least 24 sorghum blocks (associations) were developed by the initiative, but only 11 are still fully operational now after the Taiwanese Technical Mission pulled out its support in 2011. These remaining 11 blocks are pursuing a vision of adding value to their product through pro-

cessing and packaging in order to sell directly to the consumers/retailers in an effort to realise better income.

Cospe Project Coordinator Bheki Bulunga revealed during the handing over ceremony the historical background of the farmers. He said the farmers had formed their own umbrella body called Lubombo Sorghum Board, which is responsible for representing sorghum farmers interests, promoting production and finding



said "the farmers plans was mainly to have a central place where they can deliver their product for milling and packaging and sell directly to retailers or end-users".

Bulunga further

However, Bulunga said farmer's lack of resources for purchasing the neces-

sary equipment the sheller and mill for processing, necessitated the intervention of the Swazi Project, funded by the European Union to assist the farmers.

The Swazi Project implementation involved many stakeholders with sorghum production training in collaboration with the ministry of agriculture, management plan, marketing, cooperative training, mill machine operation.

The project further implemented infrastructure development that involved rehabilitation of the mill structure and electricity connection at a cost of E76 254.97, provision of the ROFF Mill with a rate of 550kg an hour at a cost of E257 187.00.

Capacity

Bulunga said the project also provided institutional capacity to the sorghum farmers in strengthening their sorghum board, facilitated their trading license and as well as supported the process of the legal registration of the board as a cooperative.

The project also facilitated the business aspect of the sorghum farmers' cooperative where a contract of milling 75.8 metric tons of mealie-meal in a space of three months was facilitat-

The farmer's project was also affected by the persistent drought over the last two years, Bulunga said the project failed to bring any returns to the farmers during that time hence the mill couldn't handle the packaging and marketing as there were no products due to the drought situation.

The project coordinator also highlighted the issue of sustainability of the project saying "The Pro Swazi Project has been inhibited by failing to assist the farmers as they would have loved but due to financial and the drought constrains, the sorghum processing and marketing have been compromised."

However, Bulunga said he believed with the money the farmers association got from the contract facilitated by the Swazi Project where they were able to process 75.8 metric tons they will be able to carry out their business. Bulunga also assured farmers that the ministry of agriculture will continue to assist them with technical expertise on production and marketing.

The project coordinator also said the Swaziland National Agriculture Union will also be available to provide some technical expertise through their marketing officer.

Mpolonjeni is situated in the lowveld, an area which is good for farming of sorghum and other drought resistant crops such as cotton and beans.

ASIANS PROLIFERATION: FEAR BT TECHNOLOGY COULD FALL ON INDIANS



Participants at a recent workshop on the introduction of genetically engineered (GMO) cotton seed to farmers on Swazi Nation Land raised concerns that Indians, currently making major inroads into Swazi business activity, could take over the new technology ahead of local farmers.

This happens when the country is still anxiously waiting for a parliamentary investigation into the proliferation of Asians into Swaziland space where they acquire such rights as those of land and business on Swazi Nation Land. Parliamentary probe team leader Zombodze Emuva Member of Parliament Titus Thwala could only say the report is 'very close' to coming out.

However, officials from the Swaziland Environment Authority (SEA) felt there was no need to press any panic buttons because all the regulatory mechanisms for safety had been put in place through the Biosafety Act of 2012 which also took into account socio-economic considerations.

On the parallel, in particular Dr. Phumzile Dlamini, wanted these specifications played out in the regulatory provisions that local farmers will not find themselves competing for the limited land with Indians who boast a financial muscle and are known to penetrate all spheres of legal structures to have it their way as they have done in many areas of business. This brief debate took place during the tour of the Malkerns trail farms, ahead of a similar tour to Big Bend, both organised jointly with the Swaziland

The other pressing problem was that of Swazi Nation Land being made available to Indians even when there is sufficient legislative framework and regulation to protect the indigenous Swazi from any form of domination, especially in the area of land ownership. It must be made known that the providers of the technology are from India. Also to fuel this debate was the cost of the technology itself, whether the average Swazi farmer would be able to afford the seed. It was later understood that once the technology is available to the local farmers, it will indeed be affordable with multiple returns than the present costs associated with conventional

Experts agree that a few studies have reported some of the costs associated with bringing to market genetically-modified (GM) crops but no comprehensive studies exist on the

real cost of the entire process of developing and releasing one GM variety by a not-for-profit institution in a developing country for sustainable agriculture. Despite the lack of documented studies, it is commonly assumed that such an undertaking is cost prohibitive, based on mere hearsay, and on two private sector cost assessments. A study that assessed the costs and the time expenditures to two notfor-profit programmes, one lead by CIP and the other by Cornell University, of developing a late blight resistant (LBr) potato variety for release in one developing country. CIP's costs run to USD1.6 million over eight years, while Cornell's costs amount to USD1.4 million over nine years. Exogenous disturbances might result in insignificant increases in cost, but can increase time expenditure significantly. A sensitivity analysis revealed that the total cost is markedly influenced by technical parameters determining the production and identification of the precommercial Br transgenic event.

At Malkerns, agronomist Nhlanhla Hlophe said the trials began on November 28 and were within the timeline but usually farmers are advised to start planting between September and the first three weeks of October their conventional variety. The research is undertaken as per request by the Swaziland Cotton Board with the Bt seeds from India and trials conducted with the assistance of the Malkerns Research Centre of the ministry of agriculture. The seeds were replicated six times and these are for JKCH 1947 for Bt and JKC 724 Non Bt; the ALBA)PLUS QM 301 non Bt and the JKCH 1050 Bt. Hlophe said the conventional variety grown traditionally in Swaziland is the best in Africa (in which the Bt is introduced) but only that boll worms simply love them, hence the technology to get rid of this weakness. On November 15, 2016 SEA Acting Executive Director Isaac Gcina Dladla issued the approval to conduct contained use activity using genetically modified organisms (GMOs) by issuing Approval Number: 001, the first of its kind that is valid until May 31, 2017. Lessons to be learnt from Burkina Faso's decision to drop GM cotton

he thorny topic of genetically modified (GM) crops was recently thrust into the global spotlight again. Speaking at the World Economic Forum in Davos, Bill Gates said GM crops are a necessary tool to fight hunger and poverty in Africa.

But something Gates did not discuss was the news that the largest and most significant African adopter of GM crops – Burkina Faso – recently began a phase out of Bt cotton. Bt cotton is the most widely grown GM crop by poor farmers in Africa. Why would Burkina Faso, a nation that struggles with hunger and poverty, turn its back on the very tools Gates and others so ardently support?

The approval was granted subject to conditions: the Swaziland Cotton Board conducts the field trials only on the two sites that were approved by the National Biosafety Advisory Committee (NBAC); the confined field trials (CFTs) should have restricted public access; the Swaziland Cotton Board is responsible for protecting the seed during entry into the country, transportation, storage (lock and key), use, until at post-harvest (crushing), and the Swaziland Environment Authority should be informed of the status at all stages; the Swaziland Cotton Board should submit a crop management programme for the 2016/17 planting season for both sites. This should include, but not limited to: transport of seeds to the different sites for planting and the planting dates, harvesting, transportation of seed-cotton to the gin, crushing of the seeds, transportation of any material from the GM crop to neighbouring countries. The SEA should be informed if there are any changes from the information that has been submitted as Schedule 1 and Schedule 5 of the application to conduct CFTs. The Swaziland Cotton Board shall be responsible for the implementation and supervision of the day-today activities in both sites and will always be expected to be on sight when monitoring or inspection (announced or unannounced) by the competent authority is done. The approval is not transferrable and is valid for: one cotton grown season (2016/17 season).

HOW BURKINA FASO CAME TO BE AN EARLY ADOPTER

In 2003, Burkina Faso became one of the first African countries to begin field trials of Bt cotton. This was done in partnership with the agriculture company Monsanto. Bt refers to a toxin – Bacillus thuringiensis – that kills one of the world's most common and pernicious cotton pests, the bollworm. Monsanto agreed to backcross the Bt gene onto local Burkinabè varieties, which were subsequently released to farmers in 2008.

Burkina Faso's adoption of Bt cotton made big news. Not only is Burkina

Faso consistently one of Africa's largest cotton producers, but cotton is also seen as the engine driving rural development throughout large parts of the country. The introduction of Bt cotton has reportedly boosted total cotton production. In 2014, Burkina Faso had the largest number of total GM crop producers on the African continent. It has more than 140 000 small-holder farmers cultivating Bt cotton.

Burkina Faso's success story has been celebrated as an example of how GM crops can help poor farmers. Many farmers have enthusiastically adopted the technology, and for good reason. Studies show that Bt cotton has increased yields and profits. The average Bt cotton farming family gained 50% more profit than from conventional cotton.

This is despite the very high cost of Bt cotton seed. Bt cotton growers also use significantly less pesticide. The total number of sprayings has gone down from six to two, reducing exposure of damaging chemicals and saving valuable labour time.

Why the reversal

But Bt cotton hasn't been a blessing for everyone.


The inferior lint quality of Bt cotton has caused severe economic losses for Burkinabè cotton companies. This has prompted a complete phase out of all Bt cotton production over the next two years. Company officials and Monsanto representatives cite two problems with lint quality. Bt varietals produce shorter, less desirable lint. The shorter length means poorer quality, which in turn means a lower price on the international market. Even though cotton

yields are up, the amount machines are able to extract from the picked cotton has diminished. In other words, Bt cotton produces both less cotton lint, and lint of an inferior quality. Inferior lint quality is not a big deterrent for farmers, who sell their cotton at a guaranteed price to the cotton companies. But it is a critical issue for the companies themselves. The combination of shorter staples and lower lint quantities substantially undermines profits. These cotton companies also control the provision of seeds and inputs to farmers and were able to unilaterally phase out Bt cotton. This is much to the dismay of many Bt cotton farmers. ext year the country will be marking 50 years since its independence was declared by Great Britain.

Swaziland was not per se colonised but protected by the British.

However, our economy somehow has been tide to that of the Republic of South Africa, ever since the creation of the South African Customs Union in 1910.

In recent years our economy has suffered mainly due to our over reliance on SACU receipts which are controlled by Pretoria, South Africa.

This week credit rating agencies are reviewing South Africa's political stability situation, following their concerns about leadership issues within the ruling party, the African National Congress, in particular the leadership of President

In December 2015, Pretoria's rating was on the verge of being downgraded when the president dismissed then finance minister Nhlanhla Nene and replaced him with little known MP Des van Rooyen.

It is this raft changes in particular within the treasury that saw the rating agencies downgrading South Africa's credit rating into Junk status, which means business and global financers have no confidence in the leadership of the Republic and cannot even guarantee that investors are now in safe hands with Pretoria.

This is where as Swaziland, Namibia and Lesotho we found ourselves in today. The downgrading of South African economy into junk status has by extension had a direct effect into our economic situation.

These countries are in the same monetary area and our currencies are pegged equally to the South African Rand.

Only Botswana, which is also a member of SACU, is not going to experience adverse effect because its currency is not pegged to the Rand.

The question we should answer now is how we should position ourselves such that much of what is happening in Pretoria does not affect

Catalysts

Dealing with Diabetes

Periods may be accompanied by changes in blood glucose

Different stages of the menstrual cycle may have different effects on your blood glucose levels and the effect can also vary from person to person and from month to month.

Recording your blood glucose results can be helpful in finding patterns in your levels and helping you to better control your diabetes.

Why will my period affect my sugar levels?

There is not a definite answer to this as periods affect each one of us differently.

However, many women report having higher blood sugar levels a few days prior to their period starting.

During your period, you may experience high blood sugar levels but some women notice a sharp drop in sugar levels so it's best to be prepared for unexpected changes to happen.

Why does blood sugar rise before or during periods?

Before and during your period, changes in the level of the hormones estrogen and progesterone can induce temporary resistance to insulin which can last for up to a few days and then drop off.

Some girls and women have consistent effects as to how their period affects blood sugar whereas other women may find the effect on blood sugar varies from one month to another.

Coping with periods

The effect on blood sugar as a result of periods can change from one month to another so keeping a diary of your blood glucose numbers can help you to see if there are any patterns in your results across different months.

If you are finding your blood glucose levels go very high before or during your period, you may need to either inject more insulin (if insulin dependent) or reduce your carbohydrate intake.

If you increase your insulin, be careful to avoid hypoglycemia as your insulin sensitivity can sometimes return quickly.

Speak to your health team if you need advice on how to manage your insulin doses or carbohydrate intake.

Increased appetite

You may also experience an increase in appetite before your period. It is best to avoid refined carbohydrates (such as white bread and sugary foods) in response to cravings as these foods raise blood glucose levels which then causes further hunger.

It is better to stick to your normal balanced meals as best as you can.


Contraceptive pill and effect on blood glucose levels

If you take a contraceptive pill, you may experience a different effect on your blood glucose levels than when you weren't taking the pill.

According to a study by the American Diabetes Association, Women with type 1 diabetes had more menstrual problems (long cycles, long

menstruation, and heavy menstruation) before age 30 years than sisters and control subjects. These differences were all statistically significant, except for heavy menstruation at age <20 years. No differences were observed after age 30 years. Women with type 1 diabetes experienced later menarche, earlier natural menopause, fewer pregnancies, and more stillbirths than women without diabetes. Multiple regression analyses revealed that type 1 diabetes caused an approximate twofold increased risk of any menstrual problem before age 30 years. These were primarily related to long cycles and long menstruation in women aged <20 and 20-29 years, as well as with heavy menstruation from 20 to 29 years. Oral contraceptives were protective for any menstrual problem and heavy menstruation from 30 to 39 years of age. With history of pregnancy from 20 to 40 years of age, any menstrual problem and long menstruation were more likely.

Since everyone is different, the only way to manage blood sugar in a setting where sensitivity to insulin changes, is to test and record blood sugars four or more times a day the week before, during and after your period for at least two or three months to find your own pattern. This allows you to adjust your insulin doses and carb intake both before and during this time to better control your blood sugar.

Premenstrual symptoms (PMS) can be worsened by poor blood sugar control. It helps to chart your feelings such as tenderness, bloat-

ing, grouchiness for a week before, during and after your period. Charting will help you know when your PMS reaches its peak during your period so that before your PMS is most severe, you can check your blood sugar more often and take extra insulin or exercise to bring high blood sugars down

Diabetes can affect a woman's reproductive health. That's because the hormones that control menstruation can cause changes in blood glucose levels. So it's important that women with diabetes learn to monitor patterns of blood glucose changes that correlate to their menstrual cycles.

Managing diabetes and you cycle

The key to knowing how your menstrual cycle affects your diabetes and vice versa is careful monitoring. You will need to track menstrual cycle changes which relate to your diabetes as closely as you would your blood sugar levels.

Experts recommend that you note any changes you observe in a record book. Watch for correlations between your menstrual cycle and diabetes over time, with the understanding that these links can change with age and other factors.

After you have established some patterns, your doctor might recommend adjusting your insulin at different points in your menstrual cycle in order to keep blood glucose levels stable.


Women with type 2 diabetes should also add regular exercise during episodes of insulin resistance in order to lower blood glucose, particularly if they are not taking insulin as part of diabetes management. Exercise can also help with premenstrual symptoms, such as bloating, water retention and food cravings.

Not all women have a regular four-week menstruation cycle; cycles can range from between 20 to 40 or more days and in some women the cycle length changes regularly. Diabetes, a condition in which a person has higher than normal blood sugar, can cause damage to the heart, eyes, kidneys, nerves, and other organs.

Unusually long, extremely irregular, or infrequent menstrual cycles may be linked to insulin resistance and the development of type 2 (or adult-onset) diabetes.

Unusual menstrual cycles may indicate metabolic changes that increase a woman's risk for insulin resistance. Insulin resistance hinders a woman's ability to process sugars and can cause type 2 diabetes over time. If you typically have very long or short menstrual cycles, especially if your menstrual cycle is highly irregular, take extra precautions to prevent the onset of type 2 diabetes.

No longer confining himself to choral, Zweli is now into opera, classical (romantic and gospel tunes).





Pre-vocational or pre-technical education programmes are mainly designed to introduce learners to the world of work and to prepare them for entry into further vocational or technical education programmes.

In Swaziland, the Pre-Vocational education programme was introduced to respond to a Parliament Motion No.6 as stated in the "National Education Review Commission (NERCOM, 1985)", policy document.

The "Skills for the Future (1990)" report also came as a result of the committee that had been established by this Parliament Motion.

The 2011 Swaziland Education and Training Sector Policy places skills building at the centre of the country's education agenda and a way of improving the country's economic competitiveness regionally and globally. The education sector policy state that: "If Swaziland is to become regionally and globally competitive, and a major regional exporter of skilled human resources, there is an urgent need to re-position and market technical and vocational education and training".

The ministry of education and training (MoET) established the Prevocational and Education programme to improve the efficiency of the education system by diversifying the curriculum to include more practical subjects such as Technical Studies, Business Studies, Home Economics, and Agriculture. This was intended to equip pupils who enrolled in this programme with knowledge, skills and attitude that will enable them to start personal enterprise for profit projects, further their education in institutions of further education and training and acquire employability skills for gainful employment.

According to the Prevocational Education and Training Senior Inspector in the Ministry of Education and Training Earnest Simelane the prevocational education in schools started operating in the year 2004 in 16 selected High Schools in all four regions of the country.

The names of the schools are as follows; In the Hhohho region Sikhunyane High School, Entfonjeni High School, Motjane High School, Somnjalose High School and Lobamba National High School. In the Manzini region the schools are as follow; Swazi National High School, Emvimbeko High School, Ngcoseni High School and Ekukhanyeni High School. In the Lubombo region the schools are as follows; Vuvulane High School, St Phillip's High School and Lavundlamanti High School. In the Shiselweni region the schools are as follows; Evelyn Baring High School, Salem High

School, Franson Christian High School and Ngwane Central High School.

All these schools are assisted with resources to operate the practical subjects. The state of equipment ranges from one school to another depending on support from management and economic status of the community of the school. In business studies, the equipment has been overtaken by changes in technology.

According to Simelane it is the wish of their department that prevocational education and training is extended to all secondary and high schools in Swaziland.

Economy

Simelane said prevocational training responds to the immediate needs of the Swazi economy which is shortage of skills to empower the youth to start entrepreneurial projects.

The thinking behind the introduction of prevocational education is to assist young people to develop personal daily living skills and entry level career competencies by providing a nurturing and flexible learning environment which supports the development of responsible citizenship and acceptable work-force qualifications. According to the senior inspector, prevocational curriculum promotes students achievement by establishing identified expectations and processes for recognising demonstrated success.

He said students in prevocational develop competencies that are measureable in an objective and consistent manner.

Competencies

Acquired competencies can be applied in the school and home setting immediately and in the future as students make a smooth transition into adult roles in the family, community, workplace and further education studies.

"In prevocational education students begin developing a range of individual basic skills which support their own personal background or interest areas that may lead to employment," said Simelane during an interview.

He added that as a result of integrated educational experiences, students also better understand their role in society, becoming more knowledge consumers and productive citizens.

The prevocational programme consists of four content areas and that is Agriculture studies, Business Studies, Home Economics Studies and Technical Studies. Learners have to choose one from these four practical options.

In prevocational education learners have to do two prevocational core subjects which are Information Technology and Entrepreneurship and five basic core subjects which are English, SiSwati, Mathematics, Physical Science and Religious Education.

Challenge

One of the major challenge of prevocational education and training in Swaziland according to Simelane is the fact that in the past, subjects under prevocational training were not accredited by Cambridge.

He said they are currently in talks with Cambridge to ensure that these subjects are accredited.

In the past, pupils studying prevocational education would receive two set of certificates, one from Cambridge and the other one for prevocational training.

According to Simelane if the plans for the ministry of education and training are successful, this will be a thing of the past.

The education and training sector policy further notes the "current uncertainty about demand for technical education and skills training compounded by under-enrolment in secondary, prevocational courses and negative perceptions about vocational courses".

For many years the Swaziland education system at the final level prepared students for further training in tertiary and not emphasised in building skills that will empower them to be self-employed and economically self-sufficient.


Simelane believes economies grow because people are able to make money and use that money to buy and support local markets.

"Prevocational training has the potential to reduce the amount of goods we import while increasing exports," said the senior inspector.

He also believes the economy of SADC will grow if SADC member countries Industrialise. Through prevocational training and education the country has skilled so many pupils in carpentry, building and construction, metal fabrication, fashion and arts, food and nutrition and hospitality and tourism.

TECHNICAL & VOCATIONAL EDUCATION TRAINING





here has been an old assumption that when it comes to business wise, the bigger the better.

However, the paradigm is changing towards the opposite these days. Most business people these days have taken the dimension of the opposite. The new trend in business development has it that the bigger the worst, hence it has becomes the duty for every creative and successful business person to maintain relatively small size when it comes to business.

However, others might argue by stating that what matters is the definition of success and not size that matter in business circles. This makes it much more challenging in the sense that when it comes to doing business, people have different views and goals. To some, it is all about making money on profit, others; it is about making a name for the business, still to some, it is about passion and social impact. The list goes on and on; bearing this in mind, it is important to argue that from the point of if there is any relationship between profit and size when it comes to business.

The case of Facebook and Instagram

One of the interesting cases in this topic is that of the case of Facebook and Instagram. Facebook purchased Instagram at a value of about \$1 billion with only 13 employees. This case somehow creates a broader base of debate with regards to the firm size and level of profitability.

From the academic point of view, Niresh and Velnampy (2014:57) argue that it is important to state that the size of a firm is a primary factor in determining the profitability of a firm due to the concept known as economies of scale which reveals that contradictory to smaller firms, items can be produced on much lower costs by bigger firms. In accordance with this concept, a positive relationship between firm size and profitability is expected.


Kim and Ployhart (2014:363) gives a clear situation analysis by stating that the relationship between firm size and profitability lies within several factors of which resource management and allocation was fundamental. These researchers argue that as production increases without corresponding increases in human capital inputs (e.g., hiring more staff), costs are reduced while profits are raised, thereby increasing financial slack resources. Slack resources can then be used to expand operations, pursue new product innovations, and reach new customers. The situation illustrated here brings to light the relevance of an interplay relationship between two variables in question namely profit and firm size.

Pursuing self interests

On the other hand, Niresh and Velnampy (2014:57) states that alternative theories of the firm advise that larger firms come under the control of managers pursuing self-interested goals and therefore managerial utility maximisation function may substitute profit maximisation of the firms' objective function. The concepts established by these two schools of thought namely those who advocate for the firm size and those who do not create a much broader perspective of analysis; an entrepreneurial perspective argues that the smaller the better because all the interest of the business

were directly being taken care of.

Structures of communication are clear and straight to the point. Employees are few and strategically placed, making the process of creativity and decision making much easier. Other groups argue a firm must increase in capacity for strategic reasons, the bigger the firm, the easier it becomes because the additional costs of sourcing, becomes relatively low, the firm begins to provide for itself, hence reducing cost of production which is also called the internal economies of scale. The understanding by Niresh and Velnampy (2014:57) is supported by the views of Quangyen and Yezhuang (2013:229) who argue that in as much as it is important to up scale the profile of a business with the bid of maximising profits, the fact of training and inducting new staff in an organisation can be reducing agent. The more the staff in an organisation, the more expensive it might take especially in the early stages of an organisational cycle.

Technical capacity demand

However, it is important to argue that the

degree of employee expansion in an organisation was detrimental to the level of capacity demand due to the expansion in operations. It is therefore relevant to point out that organisations are influenced by many factors which come from their dynamic surrounding or from the organisation itself, it is very challenging to argue that there is was a relationship between the profit and the size of the firm. The understating to this notion is that profit and size of the firm come into play as a result of the other factors such as level of productivity of that firm which was also determined by factors like demand and supply of a commodity. with regard to this notion, it then becomes relevant to argue that it is not the size and the profitability that matters in terms of business development, rather the nature of the industry in which the business was operating from, as in the case of Facebook and Instagram, the demands of the industry is not labour driven rather intellect because most of the work was done by the machines. (Quangyen and Yezhuang (2013:230).

any kind animal-lovers are cruel to their pets through ignorance - docking a puppy's tail, never taking a dog for a walk, keeping a dog on a tight leash so it cannot exercise its powerful sense of smell, not vaccinating, not sterilizing, etc.

Sometimes a starving animal is punished for stealing food. Yet, it is the person who failed to feed the animal correctly who should be punished. Over thousands of years humans have bred dogs into dependency. They depend on us for everything. We are responsible for them. But this is not the same as active cruel-

Cruelty is a lack of empathy and is a psychological disorder common to serial killers, violent criminals and child abusers. People who are cruel to animals are likely to be or to become a danger to society and need psychological help. There are several causes behind cruelty.

Domestic violence

Domestic violence is the most common background for childhood cruelty to animals. Children who abuse animals may be repeating a lesson learnt at home; like their parents, they are reacting to anger or frustration with violence. Their violence is directed at the only individual in

the family more vulnerable than themselves; an animal.

Conversely, animal abuse is an important sign of child abuse. Animals are abused in most families treated for child abuse.

The cycle of violence

Children of violent homes often experience or witness sexual, domestic or animal abuse. Sadly, a significant percentage of child abuse victims go on to become violent abusers themselves. Animal cruelty plays two main roles in this cycle of violence: firstly the adult abuser uses dominance and violence towards house pets as a psychological weapon to manipulate and hurt the human victims. Secondly, child abuse victims will often express their intense suffering through real or represented (stories, drawings) cruelty towards the same house pets or other animals.

When children knowingly harm animals their capacity to empathise is reduced and the cycle

of violence, sexual, domestic and/or animal begins again.

In fact, the link between animal abuse and interpersonal violence is so well documented that many US communities now cross-train social-service and animal-control agencies in how to recognise signs of animal abuse. Veterinarians and other people who work with animals are required to notify the police of cases and of suspected cases of animal cruelty and neglect as possible indicators of other abusive behaviours.

Behavioural/psychotic disturbance

Apart from emotional and psychological trauma, cruelty may also result from disturbances to biological brain functions and development. Underdeveloped or improperly functioning parts of the brain related to behaviours such as impulse control and specific emotions such as empathy and anger may be the cause of some violent behaviours.

Lack of connection to nature

Relationships between humans and the natural world influence human behavior towards individual living beings and the planet as a whole. People who have no relationship with the natural world in some form are less likely to understand, relate to or empathise with animals and their welfare. A lack of connection to and understanding of other living beings creates a gap in which indifference and abuse can develop.

Culture, religion and the media

Certain cultural and religious beliefs can influence what is considered acceptable treatment of animals.

Cruelty should never be excused through tradition or repetition. The media, whether real or fictional, can also affect what society finds acceptable and what impressionable young minds absorb.

Children must understand the difference between fiction and reality.

In terms of the Laws of Swaziland (The Cruelty to Animals Act 43 of 1962) people accused of animal abuse are liable to be charged with such an offence. Report all cruelty to the Police and SAWS.

Respect for animals should be something that all the citizens of Swaziland should aim for as in the words of Gandhi "the greatness of a nation and its moral progress can be judged by the way its animals are treated".

Swaziland Standards Authority

The Government of Swaziland has a mandate to turn the economy and the country around in order to reach First World status by the year 2022.

To be able to reach the first world status as envisioned by country's authorities, the country needs to refocus its economic policies on the growth of the economy through export of locally produced goods to international markets.

The country being a member of WTO and having signed a number of trade agreements with global trading blocs makes it very possible for any Swazi business to enter international mar-

Thinking about it from our perspective, before a country can enter successfully and gain value in foreign markets, its exporters should be aware of standards/technical requirements of the countries where they want to send their products and thereafter take the necessary steps to meet those requirements.

The WTO requires therefore that members should notify WTO on all technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures that are to be put in to place in a particular country. The WTO then notifies other WTO members to give them a chance to comment on the proposed technical regulations.

This is done to avoid WTO members putting in place technical regulations that would pose

as barriers to trade. Exporters therefore need to have a designated place from which to access this wealth of export information to make informed decisions on products.

There are various reasons for this. Firstly an exporter has to gather up to date information about the applicable technical regulation in the target markets.

This can be a challenge for businesses especially small and medium enterprises (SMEs) to access information on these requirements, which may constantly be changing.

Secondly, exporters have a duty then to adapt their products to meet the target export market requirements.

Thirdly, once a company has done the adaption process on a product to meet requirements of a targeted market it has to show that it has complied by being certified by competent nation-

al authority.

The company, therefore, has to produce at the export market a certificate of compliance to the required regulations.

To help local companies meet these challenging technical requirements and to ensure that their products have easy access to foreign markets, each WTO member country is required by the WTO through its obligations as per the TBT Agreement, to set up a National WTO/TBT Enquiry Point.

The WTO recommends the establishment of national enquiry points so stakeholders from here and afar could easily obtain information about TBT and related issues, without having to identify and directly contact the agency responsible for any given function in another country.

Mechanism

The WTO/TBT Enquiry Point therefore is a mechanism set up to keep track of current and upcoming technical requirements for products of export interest so that they can be disseminated to exporters on time and in the latest available version.

The Swaziland Standards Authority (SWASA) as per the WTO TBT agreement is the designated WTO national enquiry point for Swaziland.

To fully meets its obligation as per the agreement SWASA's WTO/TBT national enquiry point has been funded by USAID Project. The National Enquiry Point, receives notifications from WTO which are basically from WTO member countries on their proposed technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures.

A summary of those that are relevant to the Swaziland economy is made and then disseminated to relevant stakeholders to make their comments. A 60 day comment period is then allowed to elapse.

The comments are to be sent back to the SWASA WTO/TBT national enquiry point which then forwards them to the WTO. All this is done in an effort to sensitise local exporters about technical regulations proposed in those countries which are targeted as markets.

The transparency requirement of the WTO requires its members to as much as possible, notify of their technical regulations to avoid standards and conformity assessment procedures becoming technical barriers to trade.

SWASA still has a pending responsibility in that we still have to conscientise the Swazi industry on the importance of the notifications, more especially responding to them in good time.

SWASA as a National Enquiry Point receives notifications from WTO which are basically from WTO member countries on their proposed technical regulations and conformity assessment procedures.

In order for Swaziland to reach the First Word status through economic growth businesses in the country and organisations such as FESBC and the FSE& CC are therefore encouraged to use the Swaziland Standards Authority's WTO/181 national enquiry point to obtain information regarding standards, technical regulations, food safety measures and conformance assessment requirements of products of their interest in the international target markets. Businesses especially SMEs are also encouraged to cut costs and use SWASA for certification of their products which are destined for targeted international



Recipes

Guava Jelly

Ingredients

- Three cups guavas, peeled and chopped
- Three cups water
- One tablespoon apple cider vinegar
- •3/4 cup sugar
- · Two limes, juiced
- One teaspoon salt

Method

1. Place all of the ingredients in a medium

saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer for 30 minutes.

2. Remove from heat and let cool. Pour mixture through a fine mesh sieve to separate the seeds. Using a large spoon, press down

on the solids to release the juices. 3. Return the now seedless mixture back to the saucepan and return to a boil. Reduce heat

to medium-low and let simmer for 40 minutes

or until thickened. 4. Remove from heat and let cool. Pour into jars and refrigerate until use. The jelly will thicken as it cools.
















THE PASTOR'S KID

First of all, we do not have our own parents, you know why? Because we have to share them with other people, and we are completely fine with it because it is something we actually do not have control over.


But the problem arises when the pastor is just never around for his biological children but is always with the spiritual children. Now that's a problem because the joy of having a father is stolen from us.

ZUMA TARGETS APARTHEID-ERA SPATIAL DEVELOPMENT

RETORIA - President Jacob Zuma has challenged local government leaders to tackle apartheid-era spatial planning to facilitate what he calls radical economic transformation.

Zuma told local government leaders at a summit in Midrand that apartheid spatial planning ensured the majority were housed away from city centres and economic hubs.

He said this, in turn, perpetuated their exclusion from the economy. The president said this must change and that radical economic transfor-

mation was now his main focus until the end of his term.

"They must include effective public transport infrastructure that must be developed by us, as well as new integrated and sustainable human settlements and post-apartheid cities that are more connected, liveable, smart and green. That is at the heart of what we need to do as municipalities. Change the face of South Africa to a democratic South Africa away from the face of apartheid South Africa," said the president. But municipalities said they face



Speaking at the same event, South African Local Government Association President Parks Tau revealed the total debt owed to municipalities amounts to R117-billion. Ironically, Tau said, government was among the main debtors.

He added that the situation constrains municipalities' ability to service debts to their creditors, including power utility Eskom.

"In fact eMalahleni is a particularly typical environment that we're dealing with. What is owed to

eMalahleni by government and what eMalahleni owes to Eskom, actually cancel each other out.

"So the question is how do we manage both situations of government paying eMalahleni so that it's able to meet its obligations, over and above the obligations that residences and businesses have to eMalahleni. "That's why we're calling for a comprehensive review and a look at the entire situation, so that we can have a long lasting solution to this problem," said Tau. eNCA

'People resign, we replace them

OHANNESBURG - African National Congress Secretary General Gwede Mantashe has criticised former ministers who have resigned as MPs this week after they were dropped from President Jacob Zuma's Cabinet.

Mantashe said on Thursday that former Energy Minister Tina Joemat-Petterson, Transport Minister Dipuo Peters and Deputy Finance Minister Mcebisi Jonas should have learned from SACP MPs who had previously stayed on in Parliament when Zuma fired them in 2014.

The three resigned as MPs one after the other — after being sacked last Thursday by Zuma.

Mantashe lashed out at the now former MPs who quickly resigned in a clear attempt to preserve lucrative pension benefits, accumulated through their ministerial jobs, which were likely to plummet had they stayed on as ordinary legislators who earn less than members of the executive.

"The pension structure of Parliament as you know, people are removed as ministers, they resign to protect their pensions. When people get to the back benches they lose their pensions. Their pension will be calculated at the rate of a backbencher," said Mantashe.

"In the past when Derek [Hanekom] was removed as a minister [of agriculture], Derek remained in Parliament as a backbencher.

"He was reappointed as minister and therefore you can expect it from Derek that he will not resign. A communist minister like Ben Martins, didn't resign when he was removed [in 2014]. A communist minister like Yunus Carrim didn't resign when removed [also in 2014]. All the other ministers when removed they ... go and try to protect their pensions," said Mantashe.

Hanekom confirmed on Thursday that he would not be resigning. "No I'm not [resigning]. My plan is to remain until the end of the term," he said. Peters and Jonas could be reached for comment.

Joemat-Pettersson said in a statement that Parliament was "not the only site of struggle for radical economic transformation." She planned to "continue to make a small contribution" in the national executive committee of the ANC. But when contacted by The Times, for comment she said: "I'm sorry, I'm busy right now okay, bye."

A technical glitch on the part of Parliament fuelled speculation that MPs such as former Finance Minister Pravin Gordhan, Jonas, Peters, Joemat-Pettersson and former public service and administration minister Ngoako Ramathlodi would resign after their names were erroneously removed from Parliament's website. *SowetanLive*



Somali Landmine kills 14 in minibus

SOMALI -At least 14 people were killed and several others injured when the minibus they were travelling in hit a landmine in the southern Somali region of Lower Shebelle Thursday, police said. "Fourteen civilians, seven of them women, were killed in the landmine explosion near Golweyn, the minibus was transporting 21 people when it ran over the landmine and most of them died in the blast," local police official Ibrahim Isack told AFP. "The mine was planted by the violent terrorists," said Isack, referring to the Al-Qaeda linked Al-Shabaab group. AFP

'Be alert during upcoming election'

NAIROBI - The US government is asking citizens residing in or traveling to Kenya to be alert to the security situation around general elections in August and the campaign period this month. Kenya has a history of electoral violence. Fighting that followed the 2007 flawed presidential election killed more than 1 000 people. Two candidates in the upcoming election have been killed, and the governor of Kenya's second-largest city, Mombasa, says his life is in danger after his bodyguard was shot in his car Monday during a campaign rally for a party colleague. AP

Egyptians denounce sexual harassment

CAIRO - Hundreds of Egyptian women and girls have come out to denounce sexual harassment and shared personal stories about it on social media,



breaking a taboo and raising the ire of some in the country's conservative majority. In posts on Facebook and Twitter from the weekend to Wednesday, rare, candid stories focused on women's first experiences of harassment, almost all of which occurred in childhood and some involving family members and teachers. AP

Morocco king names new government

RABAT - Morocco's King Mohamed VI on Wednesday named a new government headed by a member of the ruling Islamist party, following a six-month political deadlock in the North African country. Prime Minister Saad-Eddine El Othman, second-in-command of the Justice and Development Party (PJD) that triumphed in October elections, will lead a Cabinet comprised of Islamists, liberals and leftists, the official MAP news agency reported. Mohamed had named Othman premier last month. AFP

Bodies of slain UN experts flown home

Wednesday that the bodies of two of its researchers, found in a mass grave in the Democratic Republic of Congo, had been flown home for burial. US citizen Michael Sharp and Swedish-Chilean dual national Zaida Catalan were kidnapped on March 12 with four Congolese nationals in central DRC, which has been rocked by clashes between security forces and rebels since September that have left hundreds dead. The bodies of the two UN workers, who had been sent to investigate violence in the central Kasai region, were found in a grave 16 days after they were abducted. **AFP**

NIGERIA COURT UNFREEZES MILLIONS IN EX-FIRST LADY'S FRAUD PROBE

AGOS - A judge in Lagos on Thursday ordered Nigeria's anti-graft agency to release one of several bank accounts frozen as part of an inquiry into the wife of former president Goodluck. Patience had filed a complaint against the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) in September, claiming that she is the rightful owner of \$15.6 million held in several accounts.

The accounts were frozen last July as part of a money laundering and forgery investigation of some of the president's former advisers, as well top officials at four companies.

President Muhammadu Buhari, who was elected in 2015, has vowed to stamp out the graft that plagues the oil-rich country. But critics have accused the exmilitary ruler of orchestrating a witch-hunt against former officials of Goodluck's party.

On Wednesday, Buhari was dealt a setback after one of Nigeria's leading judges was cleared of 18 corruption charges, with a judge calling the accusations "highly speculative." *AFP*

'Backs West African cooperation against Islamists'

France backs efforts by West African states to boost security in their Sahel region, including a plan for a 5 000-strong multinational force to combat Islamist fighters, its foreign minister said on Thursday.

Jean-Marc Ayrault said the G5 Sahel states - Mali, Mauritania, Chad, Burkina Faso and Niger - must improve their counter-terrorism capacity.

"The countries of the G5 have decided to enter a new phase

... with the creation of a common force to protect their borders," Ayrault said after meeting Mauritanian President Mohamed Ould Abdel Aziz.

"The second phase consists of training specialised troops, not to replace Barkhane, but to strengthen it in the fight against terrorist groups, but also all sorts of trafficking that is wreaking havoc on the region," he told Reuters. Former colonial power France intervened in 2013 to drive out al Qaeda-linked mil-

itants who seized northern Mali the year before. It has since deployed some 4 000 soldiers, known as the Barkhane force, across the region to hunt down Islamists. UN peacekeepers have also been deployed to Mali.

The Sahel region, whose desert expanses stretch from Mauritania to Sudan, is home to several jihadist groups. Mali-based groups have continued to launch attacks across the region in the past 18 months. *Reuters*

TUNISIA GIVES BRITISH CALL-TO-PRAYER DJ YEAR IN JAIL

UNIS - A Tunisian court handed a British DJ a one year jail term in absentia after he played a remixed recording of the Muslim call to prayer, a judicial source said

Dax J, who left Tunisia after last weekend's set in the northeastern town of Hammamet, was sentenced to "six months for public indecency and six months

for offending public morality", said Ylyes Miladi, a spokesperson of a court in the nearby town of Grombalia.

The court dismissed charges against the nightclub owner

and an organiser behind the event in the coastal resort, but the prosecution has appealed saying the two should have checked what the DJ would be playing, he added.

A video of the alleged incident shared widely online since last Sunday shows clubbers dancing to music that includes the call to prayer. It sparked a storm of debate on social media

The DJ issued an apology, as have the organisers of the event.

Tunisia's religious affairs ministry has said: "Mocking the opinions and religious principles of Tunisians is absolutely unacceptable." *AFP*

Gambians head to polls for first post-Jammeh vote

BANJUL - Gambians head to the polls on Thursday for the first time since the departure of longtime leader Yahya Jammeh, with multiple parties poised to enter Parliament after 22 years of effective one-party rule.

Several opposition parties united to form a coalition in December to oust Jammeh from power and deliver flagbearer Adama Barrow to victory as the new president.

But internal tensions caused that coalition to break apart, meaning nine parties will run in Thursday's legislative polls including Jammeh's Alliance for Patriotic Reorientation and Construction (APRC) and the strongest traditional opposition

force, the United Democratic Party (UDP). They face a significant threat from the Gambia Democratic Congress (GDC), a youth-led party which did not join the governing coalition, and whose leader Mama Kandeh came third in the presidential poll. More than 880 000 Gambians were eligible to vote, with the polls open from 8:00 am

until 5:00 pm. The first results came out yesterday. There is no formal opinion polling in the tiny west African nation, making it difficult to establish voting intentions, but the scarcity of APRC rallies which once dominated every street during campaigning suggests voters are unlikely to give them the neartotal majority of past elections. **AFP**

Furious Putin calls US airstrikes an 'illegal act of aggression'

Russia -Furious Vladimir Putin has called the US airstrikes on Syria an 'illegal act of aggression' and suspended a deal to avoid mid-air clashes with American fighter jets over the war-torn country

The Russian president warned of grave damage to relations between Washington and Moscow which are already 'in tatters'

The United States fired dozens of cruise missiles at a Syrian airbase from which it said a deadly chemical weapons attack was launched this week.

Syrian Army officials described the attack as an act of 'blatant aggression', saying it had made the US 'a partner' of ISIS, the ex-Nusra Front and other 'terrorist organisations'.

Moscow received signals the US was launching an airstrike about 30 minutes in advance, according to a Russian ambassador to the UN - but the Trump administration did not seek Kremlin's approval. It is not known if the Russians then alerted the Syrians about the incoming strikes.

Putin said the missile strikes broke international law and halted an agreement with the US aimed at avoiding clashes between their forces in the skies over Syria.

Several dead in US strike in Syria

BEIRUT - The US military strike on a Syrian airbase has caused several deaths, said the governor of Homs province where the Shayrat base is located.

"There are martyrs, but we don't yet know the number either of martyrs or of wounded," Talal Barazi told AFP by telephone. He said parts of the base were on fire and some of the wounded were suffering from burns.

"It will take some time to determine the extent of the damages," he said.

"Of course we condemn this, all action targeting Syrian military bases is condemnable," Barazi said.

He said the forces present at the base "provide important support" in the battle against the Islamic State group in the Palmyra region, home to a famed desert city that Syrian troops recaptured from jihadists last month. AP

COURT MUST WEIGH BRAZIL'S PLIGHT IN TEMER RULING

RASILIA - Brazil's top electoral court must consider the country's plight when deciding a case accusing President Michel Temer of illegal campaign funding, an incoming justice said, suggesting the tribunal should avoid pitching the nation deeper into crisis.

Admar Gonzaga, picked by Temer to join the Supreme Electoral Tribunal (TSE) later this month, said the court must weigh Brazil's difficult economic and political situation, not just the facts of the case involving the alleged use of graft money in the 2014 election. "The TSE has a political responsibility ... We have to base our ruling on our vision of the political environment," Gonzaga told Reuters late on Wednesday.

He alluded to the fact that all major parties in the South American country stand accused




of accepting bribes and illegal funds at the time of the election.

"The whole political scene was contaminated," Gonzaga said, declining to indicate how he might vote in the case.

While Gonzaga will be just one voice on the seven-seat tribunal, his arrival on April 16 suggests the balance is swinging in Temer's favour. The president can appoint another justice next month to fill the second vacancy, and can already expect a favourable hearing from TSE President Gilmar Mendes, who is close to a party in Temer's coalition. That would put Temer just one vote shy of a potential victory that lifts the legal cloud over his administration.




'Misogyny 'played role' in election loss'

Secretary of state Hillary Clinton said Thursday that misogyny "certainly played a role" in her bruising defeat at the hands of Donald Trump in last year's US presidential election.

"I don't know that there is one answer," she told the Women in the World Summit in New York when asked why she thought she lost the white women's vote to a Republican who had boasted of groping women.

"Certainly misogyny played a role, I mean that just has to be admitted," added the former first lady and New York sena-



tor, who was treated to an ecstatic welcome and standing ovation from the crowd. "I think in this election there was a very real struggle between what is

viewed as change that is welcomed and exciting to so many Americans and change which is worrisome and threatening to so many others. *AFP*

Pope to wash feet of inmates

VATICAN CITY - Pope Francis will wash the feet of inmates at a prison known for housing mafia turncoats in an Easter week ritual meant to show his willingness to serve. The Paliano prison, located in a huge fortress outside Rome, houses many of Italy's "collaborators of justice", who can shave time off their sentences by co-operating with antimafia investigators. Given the security concerns involved, the Vatican said on Thursday the April 13 Mass at the maximum-security facility would be "strictly private". *AP*

Man fined over graffiti proposal

SHEFFIELD LAKE - A man who spraypainted a marriage proposal on an Ohio shopping centre has been fined for criminal mischief and sentenced to community service, but says he doesn't regret it. After all, she said yes. The Chronicle-Telegram in Elyria reports a magistrate in Sheffield Lake told 23-year-old Kyle Stump that the more traditional down-on-one-knee proposal might have been preferable. Stump says he thinks authorities overreacted. Stump pleaded no contest this week in Mayor's Court in Sheffield Lake, about 30km west of Cleveland. *AP*

Basque ETA group lays down arms MADRID -

Basque militant separatist group ETA, which waged



a bloody campaign for independence from Spain for over half a century, said early yesterday it had given up all its arms and explosives. The BBC cited what it said was a letter from ETA declaring it had handed all its weapons to civilian go-betweens and was now a disarmed organisation. The move stops short of a full disbanding of the organisation that has killed more than 850 people in its quest for an independent state in the mountainous Basque region that incorporates part of northern Spain and southwestern France. *AFP*

Wine industry sees little impact from fires, heatwave

TALAGANTE - A torrid summer and devastating fires across central Chile's wine belt have forced an earlier harvest this year, but there are no signs that volume or flavour will be affected, local industry experts said. High temperatures can lead to excessive sugar and alcohol in the grapes and the harvest needed to take place as soon as the right level was reached, they said. Climate change is contributing to record droughts, heat and wildfires in Chile, the world's number four exporter of wine by volume and the biggest among New World producers, threatening crops and spurring growers to move south to cooler climes. *Reuters*

Israel backs Trump's 'strong message' Syria

ISRAEL - Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said yesterday he support the "strong and clear message" sent by a US strike in neighbouring Syria in retaliation for a suspected chemical attack. The Israeli military said it had been informed in advance of a massive cruise missile strike on a Syrian airbase, the first US operation against the Damascus regime in six years of civil war."In both word and action, President (Donald) Trump sent a strong and clear message today that the use and spread of chemical weapons will not be tolerated," a statement from Netanyahu's office said. *AFP*



PRACTICE ABANDONED IN SMOGGY SHANGHAI

HANGHAI - China's notoriously murky air prevented a full running of the Chinese Grand Prix's practice sessions yesterday in a frustrating day for drivers and fans in Shanghai. Smog and damp weather combined to cut short morning practice and force the cancellation of the afternoon running without title hopefuls Lewis Hamilton and Sebastian Vettel ever laying rub-

The problem wasn't even at the track. Formula 1 said the race's medical helicopter would have been barred from landing at designated hospitals due to Chinese rules on flight visibility.

A local airport in the area even had to be closed, the FIA noted. Air quality in Shanghai was in the "unhealthy" range, according to readings put out by the US Consulate in the city.

There was no immediate

announcement on whether the situation could affect the race schedule, but further poor weather was expected this weekend.

More than half the drivers got a crack at the boggy circuit during a curtailed morning running, with Max Verstappen of Red Bull getting around the quickest.

But the situation delayed the hotly anticipated resumption of hostilities between Mercedes and Ferrari.

Hamilton and defending champions Mercedes have vowed to bounce back after their wake-up call in the season opener in Melbourne two weeks ago, where Vettel steered his Ferrari to a commanding victory.

Forlorn drivers sat in the pits or in their cars yesterday as they waited to see whether the afternoon's practice would ever get under way before time eventually ran out. AFP

ONDON - Antonio Conte has provided the clearest indication yet that he will stay at Chelsea next season, despite persistent talk of a return to Italy.

The Blues manager is close to landing the Premier League title in his first season at the club but rumours of a summer switch to Inter Milan are refusing to go away.

Andrea Pastorello, an Italian agent, was quoted in Italy suggesting he might be tempted to leave.

Conte is contracted to Chelsea until 2019 but the club want him to extend his deal this summer.

"Pastorello is a friend," he said. "I know him well but I don't like it when others speak for me.

'We're fighting for the title and we want to achieve this goal, then we'll try to build something important together."

Asked whether that meant he would stay at Chelsea next season, Conte



replied: "Yes, for the next season." Meanwhile, the FA will not punish Diego Costa for his apparent kick at Vincent Kompany in Chelsea's win over Manchester City on Wednesday.

Referee Mike Dean saw the inci-

dent and dealt with it at the time, so Costa will not be punished retrospectively. That 2-1 win at Stamford Bridge edged Chelsea closer to the title, but Tottenham's Jan Vertonghen believes the stress of leading may yet take its toll. Daily Mail

The Bahia state side use each player's number to advertise the price of an item in the supermarket to draw in potential customers.

The shop's product is placed above the player's squad number, with the large number representing the price in Brazilian reales, and a small number beside it the centavos.

In case you were wondering, a pizza goes for R\$10.98, conveniently sported by the star striker Fernando Sobral, and Palmolive Shampoo retails at R\$5.98. This takes local sponsorship to a whole new level. The 90s pop band Wet Wet Wet backed their local side Clydebank in 1993 and The Undertones even featured their beloved Derry City on the front of an album cover. But, this is community spirit in all of its glory.



But that community spirit could not spur them on to win against state rivals Vitoria de Bahia on Wednesday as the team donned the shirts during the 6-0 defeat. The club's Marketing Director, Xito Melo, said football was harder on smaller clubs and they need to be innovative to attract investors and keep up with the big guns.

The 24-year-old was promptly innun-



dated with messages from outraged Real fans and so felt compelled to address the speculation later that night.

He wrote: "I'm not going to Barca. With the photo, I wanted to say that we wanted to eat them with potatoes. #HalaMadrid!!"

MASTERS AGONY FOR DUSTIN JOHNSON ONDON - It took a long

time for the opening round of the 81st Masters to shake off the disappointment of losing the favourite Dustin Johnson without him playing a

As the evening shadows descended, however, the first day drew to a dazzling crescendo as Rory McIlroy threw off the shackles, Lee Westwood finished with a flourish and Sergio Garcia became the only man to play 18 holes without a bogey.

Best of all was a round of superlative quality from 40year-old American Charley Hoffman, who defied the devilish gusts and significant breezes to accumulate 10 birdies and somehow post a 65

"It was so difficult at times out there that at one stage I didn't think we'd see 10 birdies from the entire field, let alone one man," said Sir Nick Faldo, on American television. "I would rank it right alongside the finest first rounds in majors I have ever seen."

The history books backed up Faldo's argument. Hoffman's display was so good nobody else could get within four shots of him and you have to go all the way back to the 1941 Masters when Craig Wood was five clear to find the last time a first-day frontrunner established so big

As player after player came in and described - with good reason, it has to be said - how tough it was and the cruel beauty of Augusta revealed itself, Hoffman kept hitting iron shot after iron shot close to the hole.

It really was as though he was playing a different course as he registered a card that was a full 10 strokes better than the aver-

age score on the day. The only other man to (break 70 was American journeyman William McGirt, with a 69.

"I came in here with a bit of confidence after two top-four finishes recently but it was really special to see so many putts go in the hole," said Hoffman, who opened with rounds of 67, 68 in 2015, before going on to finish ninth.

IVERPOOL - Sadio Mane's season is over after Jurgen Klopp admitted the Liverpool winger needs surgery to rectify a knee problem.

The Senegal international was injured during last weekend's 3-1 win over Everton when he collided with Leighton Baines.

Initially Mane hoped the issue would settle down but two subsequent scans have determined there is no other option but for him to undergo an operation. It is a huge blow for Klopp but, more worryingly, he could also be without Philippe Coutinho for today's trip to

Stoke.

The Brazil international, whose role had assumed even greater importance following the injury to Mane, is a major doubt for the game at the Bet365 Stadium.

Surgery

Coutinho was ill during Wednesday's 2-2 draw with Bournemouth and had to be substituted. He has remained at his home for the past 48 hours in a bid to recover but Klopp says his involvement will be decided at the last minute.

Klopp said; "Pretty sure he [Mane] will need surgery, not 100 per cent when but that is clear. His season is

over. I expected it when I saw the video afterwards.

"He was lucky. It will be impossible for him to play again this season but he will have a long break and be ready for next season.

"Coutinho was not at Melwood yesterday or today. I have to speak to the doctor. Stoke is not that far away [to travel], it will be really close."

On Liverpool's other team news, Klopp added; "Adam Lallana is better but not ready. It is the 'shooting' muscle. He needs a few more days before we can have him back on the pitch. *Daily Star*

SANCHEZ WANTS TO STAY AT ARSENAL - WENGER

ONDON - Arsene Wenger believes Alexis Sanchez wants to stay at Arsenal, despite reports the striker could leave the London club if they fail to qualify for the Champions League.

Veteran French Manager Wenger, in charge of Arsenal since September 1996, has yet to announce if he will stay with the club when his own contract expires at the end of the season and the Gunners boss was giving little away again yesterday. But he was rather more forthcoming about the future of 28-year-old Chile forward Sanchez, whose own Arsenal deal expires at the end of next season.

"I believe that basically he wants to stay at the club and it's down to finding an agreement with his agent," said Wenger. "I think the players first have to see if they are happy to the club and after (that) most of the time, it's down to finding an agreement, but the finances are involved in it, yes."

Prospects

Wenger, speaking ahead of Arsenal's match against London rivals Crystal Palace on Monday, was again tight-lipped about his own prospects with the Gunners. Arsenal last won the Premier

Arsenal last won the Premier League title in 2004 and the pressure on Wenger has intensified this season, with the club often looking as though they will miss out on a top four spot that secures Champions League qualification.

GUARDIOLA NEEDS HULL OF A BOOST

ONDON - Manchester City's season has hit a bump at a bad time, and a victory at home to Hull City today will help bolster their bid to play Champions League football

City's 2-1 defeat at leaders Chelsea on Wednesday means they have now gone more than a month without a Premier League victory.

Successive league draws against Stoke, Liverpool and Arsenal, followed by the result at Stamford Bridge, have seen City manager Pep Guardiola's team slip to fourth place in the standings.

They were also eliminated from the Champions League by Monaco during that period, meaning that the City Manager's only realistic hope of ending his first season in England with a trophy lies with the FA Cup.

Successful

It has been a less successful campaign than many predicted when Guardiola arrived from Bayern Munich in July with a record of 21 trophies from seven seasons in management.

In the Spaniard's defence, the squad he has taken on at City does not have the spread of world-class talent that he worked with at Barcelona and in Munich, but there have been many signs that the competitive nature of the Premier League has taken him by surprise.

Amid the disappointment of defeat at Stamford Bridge, one significant bonus for Guardiola was the return to action of Vincent Kompany.

Hazard key to Chelsea success - Courtois

ONDON - Thibaut Courtois believes keeping Eden Hazard is key to Chelsea hopes of building on this season's dominance of the Premier League title race.

Hazard confirmed his importance to Antonio Conte's side with both goals in the 2-1 victory over Manchester City on Wednesday that moved Chelsea one step closer to the title ahead of today's trip to Bournemouth.

The Belgium forward has been linked with a move to Real Madrid, but Chelsea goalkeeper Courtois, Hazard's international teammate, is anxious to see the 26-year-old remain at Stamford Bridge and fire the west London club towards its next target.

The failure to qualify for European competition last year was a major setback for the club and they will return to the Champions League next season with a renewed hunger to challenge the biggest clubs on the continent.

"Eden is one of the best players in the world. Chelsea have ambitions to win the Champions League again and always look to play for the title," Courtois said.

"If you want to do that, you need the biggest players and he is obviously a big part of that."

The victory over City maintained Chelsea's seven-point lead over second placed Tottenham with just eight games remaining.

Faltered

Having faltered against Crystal Palace the previous Saturday, the win restored Chelsea's momentum.

But Blues centre-back Gary Cahill insists nothing can be taken for granted when they visit Dean Court this weekend.

"We expect that Tottenham are going to push us all the way," Cahill said. "They are never going to give up and we know that, so we just have to look after ourselves.

"We need to look at what we are doing and win our games.

"We have to show the same commitment and work-rate as against Manchester City, and also the ability. AFP

'STOKE WILL SEE BERAHINO'S BEST NEXT SEASON'

ONDON - Manager Mark Hughes said he does not expect Saido Berahino to produce his best football for Stoke City until next season as the striker is still finding his feet at the Premier League club.

Berahino, who joined Stoke from West Bromwich Albion in January, has not scored a league goal in over a year, and had seen his career stall at his former club due to off-field incidents.

The 23-year-old is yet to score in eight appearances for Stoke.

"(Berahino) hasn't played a lot of football this year and he's still getting up to speed. These games are invaluable and I feel we will see a marked difference next season," Hughes told reporters yesterday.

Difficult

"It's always difficult coming in at halfterm but he's integrated well into the squad and we want to get him up and running in terms of goals."

Giannelli Imbula, who joined the club for a record 18.3 million pounds from Porto in 2016, has made only two league appearances for Stoke this year and Hughes urged the midfielder to make the most of his game time. *Reuters*

Kaizer Chiefs have announced the departure of Edward Manqele after agreeing to the cancellation of his contract with the Premiership club via mutual consent.

The much-maligned striker struggled to make an impact during his stint with the Glamour Boys, scoring only a single

After being transfer listed in the off-season, the decision comes as no surprise as both parties agreed it's in everyone's best interests to part ways. "Manqele was transfer listed at the end of last season but was not signed," Chiefs football Manager Bobby Motaung told the club's official website. "After speaking we agreed it was best to release him so he can find a new home and continue his football career." 

Former England striker Cole has kidney transplant

ONDON - Former England striker Andrew Cole has had a kidney transplant, it was announced yesterday.

The news was made public by Manchester United, one of his former clubs where the 45-year-old Cole is now an ambassador.

"Manchester United ambassador Andrew Cole has undergone a kidney transplant operation at Manchester Royal Infirmary as part of his treatment for a condition called Focal Segmental Glomerulosclerosis," said a United statement.

"During his recuperation, Andrew will be taking a break from his role as Manchester United Ambassador.

"Andrew and his family would like to thank the club and fans for their support. They also request that he can continue with his treatment in private, and ask that their privacy is respected."

Cole, who made his name at Newcastle United, spoke about the difficulties of dealing with his health problems in an interview with BBC Sport in February last

"Seeing the change in my body, that has been tough, it wreaks havoc with you," he said. "You get comments like, 'Andy Cole's let himself go, who ate all the pies?',' Cole said.

"I have to take it day by day. I am four months off a year and it has been tough going through this process."

Cole scored 121 goals in 275 appearances for Manchester United, winning five English league titles during his time at Old Trafford as well as the Champions League.

He started his career at another Premier League club in north London side Arsenal.

Cole, who won 15 England caps, also had spells at Bristol City, Blackburn, Fulham, Manchester City, Portsmouth, Birmingham, Sunderland, Burnley and Nottingham Forest before retiring in November 2008.

ADRID - Atletico Madrid midfielder Koke was threatened at gunpoint and had his £60 000 watch stolen on Thursday.

The Spain international was driving his car in an underground car park in Madrid's Chamberi district when a motorcyclist, brandishing a gun, followed and then confronted him.

The gunman put the weapon to his temple as he wound down his window to take a ticket at the barrier and eventually got away with the 25-year-old's watch, with the incident occurring at around 7pm.

Koke, who is preparing for the Madrid derby against fierce rivals Real today, reported the assault at the nearby police station.

It is believed the assailant only got away with the footballer's timepiece before escaping the underground car park on his motorbike, according to El Mundo.

The 25-year-old joined up with his Atletico team-mates to take part in training yesterday morning ahead of their upcoming La Liga fixture.

Diego Simeone has named the midfielder in his squad for the crunch clash and Koke is expected to play a midfield role against Real, who are leading La Liga.

Atletico trail their city rivals by 10 points but will undoubtedly want to dent Real's title hopes with victory at Santiago Bernabeu this afternoon.

'12-year TV deal not good for African football'

OHANNESBURG -The new CAF President, Ahmad Ahmad, says they are investigating the 12-year broadcasting deal with Lagardère Sports that was signed by Issa Hayatou.

CAF have been criticised after reportedly brokering the partnership without allowing any other bidders to get involved, with Hayatou and the former general secretary, Hisham El Amrani, being targeted for legal action.

After Ahmad beat Hayatou in the CAF Presidential elections last month, the Malagasy has spoken of several changes that could come in under this reign, including a possible change of broadcasting deal.

He told the media in Johannesburg yesterday, "The contract was signed by the previous CAF president. Right now there are procedures against this contract, we just got elected and I've appointed people to look after this contract, people who are specialised in TV and in marketing, to study this case about the contract.

"We took a decision after a discussion with the previous general secretary, and we did this to protect the Confederation of African Football against any wrongdoing. This is why the previous general secretary left the office, and we agreed."

Ahmad went on to say that he is awaiting the analysis of those who have been appointed to study the contract but explained that there is unanimous agreement that it is not a good

deal for the continent.

He said, "We're living in an environment where everything must be transparent and with a democracy. The new CAF will follow up with everything that is not a transparent or democratic. This is why I'm waiting for the analysis to come back to me before I make any decision.

"Everyone is completely agreed that it is not a good contract, and is not good for African football. Right now I can guarantee you that I will never sign any long contract regarding CAF."

CAF previously denied any wrongdoing, however, it appears that they have changed their tune now that Hayatou is no longer in charge.

GRIEZMANN EYES ATLETICO ASSAULT ON REAL

ADRID - Antoine Griezmann believes Atletico Madrid can inflict the worst possible start to a season defining two-weeks for Real Madrid as Atletico go for a record fourth straight La Liga win at the Santiago

Griezmann scored the winner last season as Atletico became the first side to ever win away to Real in the league for three consecutive seasons.

"I see us as favourites. I believe in my teammates and the coach," said a bullish Griezmann on Thursday.

Despite their triple assault on the Bernabeu, Atletico have still had to play second fiddle to Real after losing to their city rivals in the Champions League for each of the past three seasons - twice in the final.

Real were also the dominant force when the sides last met in November as Cristiano Ronaldo's hat-trick sealed a 3-0 win. Zinedine Zidane's men



Henry admits Arsenal may struggle to make top four

ONDON - Arsenal legend Thierry Henry has admitted he doesn't think his former club will be able to finish in the Premier League's top four this season.

The Gunners were still in the top four early last month, but back-to-back defeats to Liverpool and West Brom, followed by a 2-2 draw at home against Manchester City, has seen them drop to fifth position.

Despite only sitting four points behind fourth-placed City, with a game in hand, Henry believes Arsenal will find it difficult to close the gap on the top four sides. "Arsenal usually finish in a strong way and the top four still have to play each other, but it's difficult to see Arsenal making it," Henry told Sky Sports.

"It is a massive gap now to finish in the top four.

"I will say in comparison to how they played against West Brom, it was a massive improvement against Man City."





Tomorrow, capital city giants Mbabane Jazz will take on youngsters Dunkylaine.


Both teams come into the game wounded as Jazz lost against Steels while the Mzwakhe Phiri-led charges received a thorough thrashing from defending champions Superstars.






