



Bishop full of praise for Their Majesties

LEADER of the Christian Gospel Mission Church in Zion in Pongola, South Africa, Arch Bishop Busisiwe Myelase thanked Their Majesties for the support they give to her church.

Bishop Myelase who is also Deputy Mayor of Pongola succeeded her late father Israel Bhengeli Linda to be the leader of the church which also has branches in Swaziland.

KING URGES CHRISTIANS TO PRAY FOR 2018 ELECTIONS

HIS Majesty King Mswati III has urged Christians to pray for the 2018 national elections.

The King was speaking through Indvuna Lusendvo Fakudze when addressing members of the Christian Gospel Mission Church in Zion in Pongola in South Africa.

The King said through prayer, the 2018 elections would proceed smoothly.

Fakudze was representing Their Majesties during an all night prayer for the church whose leader

is Arch Bishop Busisiwe Mvelase who is also Deputy Mayor at Pongola.

There were at least over 600 members of the church who were part of the service which is held annually where royalty is represented.

Fakudze said it has become a norm each time when there are elections that a number of incidences occur including the disappearance of people especially children.

He said it was during elections time where you hear of people having been murdered and warned anyone engaged in such evil that he or she would account for that during judgment day in heaven. He said christians should call God and request Him to touch the hearts of all evil doers to repent.

"As we are heading for elections, we should seek God's guidance and all those who think of doing something bad, should just repent. We know what happens during elections. People disappear and I urge christians to pray for this not to happen," said Fakudze.

Commissioning

Fakudze said the commissioning of a Swazi delegation by Their Majesties to join the members of Arch Bishop Mvelase's church was an indication of the relationship they have with the church. He said Their Majesties were God fearing leaders and Swazis were a fortunate nation to have leadership relying on the Almighty.

> Fakudze said he was spiritually satisfied from all the scriptures that were read during the service. He said it was not his first time being part of the service but this year, what he heard was different from the previous times he attended the service.

"I feel something different this year. I am now used to attending this service but I feel so much blessed this time around. God has been speaking through the people who shared from the scriptures," said Fakudze.

Fakudze said the trip to Pongola from Swaziland should not be considered as an ordinary journey since it was meant for a serious purpose.

"We are not holidaying here. It's God's assignment which has brought us to be part of this service. Our leaders back in Swaziland have sent us to join you in praying for peace," said Fakudze.

Fakudze also reminded everyone about the importance of always being alert as all people have a journey to travel.

He said people should know that being on earth is the same as being at a bus stop. He said it was important for everyone not to forget to gear up for their next journey. Fakudze applauded Arch Bishop Mvelase for being a strong woman and believer in Christ just like her father Israel Linda who also had befriended Swazis.

"What you are doing is what your father used

to do. He wanted the bond we had with the church to remain strong and it is pleasing to see you are taking over from where he left off," he said. Fakudze presented calendars which he said were gifts from Their Majesties for the church.

Bishop whips noisy and misbehaving members

BISHOP Benjamin Dladla of the Christian Gospel Mission Church In Zion in Pongola literally beat members of the church who were misbehaving during the all night prayer.

Bishop Dladla, a loyal servant to Arch Bishop Busisiwe Myelase and second in command in the church whipped members with the stick that zionists carry whenever they are worshipping.

The Bishop who wields influence in the church was the main programme director during the service where royalty was represented. With him having made the event lively from the time it started until it finished, Bishop Dladla was the centre of attraction as he did not hesitate to discipline members of the church who he felt were not showing any respect.

ARCH BISHOP A STRONG BELIEVER IN DISCIPLI

BISHOP Busisiwe Mvelase wants all leaders of the branches of her church to have straight partners who should be known to church members.

The leader of the Christian Gospel Mission Church In Zion in Pongola proved how she wanted things done right when some new leaders of the branches of her church were anointed during the all night prayer held over the weekend.

A handful of leaders from various branches were announced and were officially anointed. When calling the names of those elevated to

different positions, they were called together with their wives to also come up front to be prayed for as well.

There were those announced as having been promoted but their wives were not present. It was then when the Bishop was heard issuing a stern warning that her church wanted all leaders to lead straight lives to be copied by the members.

"I am not happy with this arrangement. You are supposed to be with your partners who should also be receiving anointing. It's not a good thing at all. We should know your partners and in this case, I mean your wives. We should know your wives as this church does not condone a situation where next time we are introduced to people we do not know. In fact, we should not be anointing all those that have not brought their wives," said Bishop Mvelase.

The Bishop also talked about unity in the church saying there was no way a church can progress if the members are divided. She said differences between the members as well as leadership should not happen in churches.

"Cracks experienced in churches means their downfall. We have others who plant seeds of division in the church. Others leave to start their own churches even when they know they can't cope. We have those that are jealous of others' success. We also have leaders who give glory to the leaders of the church when glory should be directed to God," said Bishop Myelase.

IS the public being taxed to the bone?

Members of the public are in for a shocking tax regime.

They will now be expected to pay the dreaded value added tax (VAT) on any medication they buy without a prescription from their respective doctors.

To avoid the 14 per cent VAT, the public is expected to go via their doctors where they will inevitable be expected to pay consultation fees to get a prescription. Failure to get a doctor's prescription, members of the public will be made to pay VAT when purchasing medicines over the counter at pharmacies.

This follows a decision by the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) to effect standard VAT on all medicines despite their schedule.

According to a notice that

pharmacies have put up in their respective outlets, the 14 per cent VAT on all medications is paid in the event one failed to produce a prescription from a registered doctor.

It further states that medicines bought upon producing a prescription will attract zero per cent VAT.

The new regulation by the SRA is an amendment of an old one that allowed people to buy medicines falling under schedules 0-2 without prescription and still not attract VAT.

The medicines which fall under these schedules include aspirin, cough medicines and antibiotics.

The new one states that regardless of the schedule that the medicines fall under, it will attract VAT in the event the buyer fails to produce a prescription to the pharmacist.

Effect

A notice which is a communication amongst all stakeholders states that the VAT (Amendment of Schedule) Notice of 2016 came into effect on April 1, 2017.

"All medicines (irrespective of the schedule) sold on production of a valid prescription will attract VAT at 0 per cent and when there is no prescription will attract VAT at the standard 14 per cent," reads the notice.

Information gathered from sources within the medical fraternity is that this move by the SRA has left the fraternity divided, with some welcoming the move and others feeling it will handicap the pharmacy business as more and more will rather go see their doctors than visit pharmacies.

New drugs needed to treat Gonorrhoea

IF new drugs to treat gonorrhoea are not found fast, the disease might become one impossible to treat.

Gonorrhoea is one of the diseases that are contracted through sexual intercourse.

It is one of the diseases referred to as sexually transmitted infections (STIs).

Gonorrhoea can infect the genitals, rectum, and throat. Complications of gonorrhoea disproportionally affect women, including pelvic inflammatory disease, ectopic pregnancy and infertility, as well as an increased risk of HIV.

Decreasing condom use, increased urbanisation and travel, poor infection detection rates, and inadequate or failed treatment all contribute to this increase.

It is estimated that 78 million people in each year are infected by this disease, worldwide.

In a statement sent to this newspaper by the local office of the World Health Organisation (WHO), Dr Teodora Wi, who is a Medical and Human Reproduction Officer, said the bacteria that cause gonorrhoea had a tendency of evolving to be resistant against medication that was used to treat them.

"The bacteria which causes gonorrhoea are particularly smart. Every time we use a new class of antibiotics to treat the infection, the bacteria evolve to resist them," Dr Wi said.

WHO reports widespread resistance to older and cheaper antibiotics. Some countries – particular-

ly high-income ones, where surveillance is best – are finding cases of the infection that are untreatable by all known antibiotics.

"These cases may just be the tip of the iceberg, since systems to diagnose and report untreatable infections are lacking in lowerincome countries where gonorrhoea is actually more common," adds Dr Wi.

The development of new antibiotics, according to the medical practitioner, is not very attractive for commercial pharmaceutical companies.

Treatments are taken only for short periods of time (unlike medicines for chronic diseases) and they become less effective as resistance develops, meaning that the supply of new drugs constantly needs to be replenished.

"The research and development pipeline for gonorrhoea is relatively empty, with only three new candidate drugs in various stages of clinical development: solithromycin, for which a phase three trial has recently been completed; zoliflodacin, which has completed a phase two trial; and gepotidacin, which has also completed a phase two trial," she said.

Dr Wi said gonorrhoea could be prevented through safer sexual behaviour, in particular consistent and correct condom use. Information, education, and communication could promote and enable safer sex practices, improve people's ability to recognise the symptoms of gonorrhoea and other sexually transmitted infections, and increase the likelihood they would seek care.

She urged people to ensure they exercised extreme caution to prevent the spread of the disease.

BEWARNED; FOUR LIONS ESCAPE FROM KRUGER

FOUR lions escaped from South Africa's Kruger National Park, in a second case in as many months.

According to the Online Mirror newspaper, the male lions were seen late on Sunday a few kilometers from the park in Matsulu village, according to the national authority overseeing it.

But authorities were still investigating how the lions got out of the park.

Residents in the area are being asked to be vigilant. However, the

incident is the second case in as many months after five lions escaped in May.

Swazis should be worried because in the past escaped lions ventured

into the country.

DBSA to participate in energy investment forum workshop

THE Development Bank of Southern Africa (DBSA) will be amongst the participants of the high-level Ministerial Resource Mobilisation Workshop and Energy Investment Forum to be held at the Royal Swazi Spa in Ezulwini.

The workshop whose objective is to forge practical and sustainable solutions capable of addressing the power deficit in the region and attracting investment into the region's energy infrastructure will run from tomorrow and end on Thursday.

In a communiqué issued by the bank, the DBSA said it will be participating in the forum in its capacity as fund manager and implementer of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Project Preparation Development Fund.

The fund is responsible for preparing sustainable infrastructure in the SADC region.

Committed

"The DBSA is honoured to be participating in this forum as the objectives are aligned to our mandate as a leading development finance institution in the region committed to delivering infrastructure projects on the continent. We believe that the forum will facilitate the exchange of ideas on addressing the energy challenges in the region," said DBSA General Manager for Project Preparation Mohale

The DBSA said since 2013, more than 60 per cent of African infrastructure investment has gone into energy projects.

Africa still experiences low levels of electrification which hinders economic growth and development, with 78 per cent of the population relying on biomass

In 2016 SADC held its 36th Summit in the country themed, 'Resource Mobilsation for Investment in Sustainable Energy Infrastructure for an Inclusive SADC Industrialisation and for the Prosperity of the Region.'

Appealing against a 32-year sentence given to him by the High Court, a convict was yesterday shocked when his legal representative failed to show up at the Supreme Court.

Convicted of attempted murder, rape, robbery and illegal possession of arms and ammunition, Boy Mchumanisi Mkhatjwa left the court dejected after Supreme Court Judges struck his matter off the court roll due to the none appearance of his defence attorney.

Appellant shocked as lawyer no show in court, appeal struck off the roll

Mkhatjwa told the full bench comprising Justices Phesheya Dlamini, Jacobus Annandale and Stanley Maphalala that he had instructed lawyer Thabo Fakudze who even visited him at the Correctional facility and had come to court knowing that he would be represented.

The court however noted from the records that the Registrar, Crown, Correctional Services nor the Court, was aware that he would be represented in the appeal.

Judge Dlamini told the convict that

the court had no option but to strike off the matter from the roll and that due to the seriousness of the offences he was convicted of, he has a right to legal representation hence he will have to solicit the services of another attorney should the one he has eventually fails to represent him.

Puts

Judge Dlamini stated that the matter would be reinstated after Mkhatjwa puts his house in order with the relevant court papers including the bundle of authorities, which must be filed in court.

The Crown represented by Principal Crown Counsel Lomvula Hlophe was ready to proceed with the matter but when the court asked Mkhatjwa if he could proceed without legal representation, he elected to seek the services of a lawyer in the matter.

"My lord I came here knowing that I would find my lawyer but am shocked that he is not present as I had given him instruction when he came to see me in prison, however I still insist that I need legal representation in my

appeal," Mkhatjwa said.

Mkhatjwa is currently serving a cumulative 32-year sentence for a string of heinous crimes that include amongst others, attempted murder, two rape offences, robbery and illegal possession of arms and ammunition

He was convicted and sentenced by High Court Judge Nkululeko Hlophe and is now appealing against the sentence. The appeal might be reinstated in the next session of the Supreme Court.

COPS DESTROY 142 GUNS

THE Royal Swaziland Police destroyed 142 illegal and unnecessary firearms at the Police College yesterday.

The exercise was carried out as an event to commemorate the United Nations (UN) Firearms Destruction Day, which is commemorated July 9 annually.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said guns are destroyed worldwide on this day as it was initiated by the UN in efforts to minimise the number of illegal or unnecessary guns.

Guns that were destroyed

included old ones, those that were found as exhibits and those that legitimate owners needed no more.

"The 9th of July is the day in which the world decided that illegal guns and ammunitions be destroyed, but that does not necessarily mean that we wait for that day to destroy firearms, if there are too many of them, they are destroyed," said Vilakati

She further highlighted that guns that are usually destroyed by the service are those that

have been retrieved from criminal offenders and those whose owners feel have no use for them

She advised the public to bring forth guns they may possess whether illegal or not.

She pointed out that even the legal firearm poses a danger if not put in a safe place. Moreover, people with family guns, should take extra care of it and if the owner has passed on, it should be surrendered to the police.

MINISTER 'BUY CASH' TESTIFIES IN MAKHUBU FRAUD CASE

MINISTER of Commerce, Industry and Trade Jabulani Mabuza, who is the director of Buy Cash Hardware, appeared in court to give evidence in the on-going trial of former Mhlatane High principal Simeon Makhubu.

Mabuza said as a company they were still shocked Mhlatane High had not settled its debt of E20 000. He said they were bemused and concerned that the debt which was accumulated in 2012 had still not been settled by the school even though a company known as M&Q Services collected goods amounting to E20 299.25 on the basis that the school would foot the bill.

Mabuza, who is one of the state witnesses paraded by the crown, further revealed that the relationship between Buy Cash Hardware and Mhlatane High dates back before the fraud scandal came to light. He said the director of M & Q Services Qhawe Nxumalo once approached the hardware with the hope of starting a business relationship with them but they rejected him.

"We only had a relationship with the school and not M & Q Services and when Nxumalo came to request that M & Q Services open a credit facility we refused and only accepted a deal after he came back with a letter from the school confirming that the school would foot the bill of chicken feed that would not exceed E20 000," he said.

Mabuza was referring to a letter written by former Mhlatane High Simeon Makhubu, whereby he requested the hardware to allow the company to take only chicken feed. The letter was parad-

ed before court as it was marked as an exhibit.

Furthermore, Mabuza revealed that the school also owed his company more money from previous business dealings and were told by the school that they would not get their payment due to the ongoing fraud court case involving the school's former headteacher and other business people who allegedly worked with the school.

Makhubu is alleged to have defrauded the school a sum of money amounting to over E1.6million. He is alleged to have used the money to spoil a bogus Inkhosikati who had promised him a job opportunity in Kuwait.

While being led in his evidence in

chief, Mabuza mentioned that the school told him a certain police officer, who is part of the investigating team, allegedly instructed the school not to pay his company until the fraud mess was over.

However, he said he was not sure if these allegations were true.

"All that I know is that we are still waiting for payment from the school," he said.

Moreover, it was revealed in court that M & Q Services used the credit facility opened by the school to purchase goods such as doors, paint and hummer yet the credit facility was specifically opened to buy chicken feed only.

"I did not see this when it was happening but I learnt about it recently when I doubled checked and I believe the company took advantage of the fact that Mhlatane opened the credit facility for them," he said.

He further mentioned that he only communicated with his managers about this arrangement not the whole staff.

"When Nxumalo came to buy the goods he would simply deal with one of our cashiers and he would be able to take other items because the arrangement was unknown to the cashiers," he added.

However, Makhubu's attorney Noncedo Ndlangamandla told the minister that he knew about Nxumalo taking other items besides the ones specified on the letter but kept quiet because he was going to be paid.

Mabuza denied this as he said Nxumalo would sometimes come when he was not in the office. He further said he knew that the Mhlatane was going to directly use the money meant to pay Nxumalo in settling the debt at the hardware.

I warned Matsebula against shooting – co-accused

 Attempted murder co-accused tells court he advised Mefika Matsebula against shooting at anyone during land squabble at Nkhaba

CHARGED with attempted murder, an elderly man of Nkhaba yesterday told the court that he warned his co-accused against pointing a gun and shooting at anyone during a land dispute.

Solomon Malambe, who took to the witness stand in his defence yesterday, told High Court Judge Nkululeko Hlophe that he was called by Mefika Matsebula to assist him as there were people from the Ngwenya family who were attacking him.

Malambe said he took his 12bore shot gun and proceeded to Matsebula whom he advised that no one should be shot, but only carried the firearms to scare the attackers away.

However, Matsebula failed to heed the advice and Ngwenya was eventually shot and injured after an altercation had ensued.

Malambe said he was the one who personally called the police through his cellphone immediately after Matsebula had informed him of the alleged attack and that he again called the police after the shooting. He was giving his side of the story in the attempted murder case in which he and Matsebula allegedly shot at Simon Ngwenya with their 12-bore shot guns over a land dispute at Nkhaba.

The two are said to have ganged up against the Ngwenya family after Matsebula had illegally built his house at the Ngwenya homestead despite that the *umphakatsi* gave the land to the Ngwenya family. After having heard that Matsebula was constructing on land that was allocated to the Ngwenya family since time immemorial, Ngwenya who resides in Mbabane, proceeded to investigate and indeed found that Matsebula had constructed the house he was ordered to stop by *umphakatsi* but he alleged-

ly defied that order and continued to erect the structure.

It was then that Ngwenya and other family members removed the corrugated iron sheets from Matsebula's house and that is when an altercation ensued resulting in the near fatal shooting.

Matsebula is alleged to have ganged up with Malambe and both of them shot at Ngwenya who was injured in the process with windows to his car also shattered.

Police were called and Ngwenya was rushed to hospital while the two, Matsebula and Malambe, were arrested and charged for attempting to kill Ngwenya. The acting Headman Absalom Shabangu last week also gave evidence in court as he stated that he was called by Ngwenya who informed him that he had been shot by Matsebula and Malambe.

He further told the court that the land in question belonged to the Ngwenya family as they were allocated by the *umphakatsi* and not Matsebula.

Shabangu together with Jele an overseer (sibondza) for the community in which the Ngwenya family was allocated land, also had occasion to address Matsebula on the matter and was told that the land belonged to the Ngwenya family and further ordered to stop constructing his house there.

Matsebula in his defence argued that he was trying to save the lives of his children and wife as he feared that the corrugated iron sheets might have injured them when removed by the Ngwenya family. Two gun shots were fired during the confrontation and both firearms were used as a ballistic expert gave evidence to the effect that one of the empty cartridges matched one of the guns belonging to both Matsebula and Malambe.

The matter continues and both Matsebula and Malambe are conducting their own defense in the matter.



SWAZIS are now expected to breathe a sigh of relief as legislation addressing the issue of fingerprints is about to be enacted.

Currently, the amendment of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act, 1938 is done by the House portfolio committee of the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs.

Stakeholders of the ministry are currently submitting their views concerning the fingerprints issue. The stakeholder submission is expected to be concluded on Friday. The public is currently encouraged to make its submissions on the issue.

Motshane Member of Parliament (MP) Phesheya Hlatshwayo was contacted by this newspaper to shed some light on the matter.

Hlatshwayo is a member of the portfolio committee and a former police officer. He was involved when police were sent by Police National Commissioner Isaac Magagula to research and find out if it would be fine for the Act to be amended on the fingerprints issue.

Hlatshwayo said Swazis of different kinds like business people and professionals did make submissions and



the response was positive. Hlatshwayo mentioned, as a matter of importance, that the law did not seek to outlaw the recording of fingerprints. But it was there to enable people to develop themselves.

"What is good about this whole issue is that Swazis saw the importance of recording fingerprints to curb criminal activities in the country. They submitted that fingerprints should not be deleted from the police system, but should not be used to prevent people from empowering themselves like educating themselves or getting employed," Hlatshwayo said.

The MP said according to the law, police would be obligated to clear a person of any criminal record if that person had not committed a crime after a certain period.

If a person had been convicted for a

year, for example, that person would have to stay for another year before he could be cleared. The clearance would only happen if no criminal activity would have been done by the said person.

Such a situation, according to the MP, would be determined by the number of years for which a person would have been convicted. The weight of the crime that would be committed by the person would also be taken into consideration.

Hlatshwayo said the situation would be much better that way because people who have decided not to commit a crime would be at an advantage. "The problem now is that even people who committed criminal activities 10 years ago can still be prevented by fingerprints to empower themselves. There is no reward for people who want to stop doing criminal activities," he said.

The legislator said there was no way in which fingerprints would be totally deleted from the police records. That could be suicidal because the rate of crime could escalate in the country.

The Act, after the submissions, will be tabled before the House of Assembly, together with a report of the portfolio committee. Once the House adopt the committee's report on the amendment, the House will eventually enact the amended legislation.


The construction of the classrooms was one of the major projects during the annual Swazi MTN 21 Days of Y'ello Care.

IT never rains but pours for an alleged victim of police brutally who works at Montigny Investments in Bhunya.

Samukelisiwe Matsebula was allegedly beaten by police in October last year, after an alleged scuffle with her supervisors at her workplace. Matsebula suffered injuries in the process, up to a point where she required medical assistance to attend to her injuries.

Matsebula has been receiving treatment since and was admitted at Mbabane Government Hospital last week because the injuries she suffered were not hearing. She was eventually discharged yesterday, after spending the whole weekend at the hospital.

Speaking to this newspaper in her hospital bed, Matsebula said the injury has been a problem as she was allegedly beaten by the Bhunya police officers."The injury is not getting any better because I was operated just after being admitted in this hospital," Matsebula said.

The Montigny employee, who was employed through a labour broker, was not being admitted for the first time because of the injury. In December last year, she had to be admitted at Good Shepherd Hospital in Siteki, where she was also operated

However, her difficult financial situation does not make matters any better as she could not return to the hospital because

of financial constraints, but eventually managed to get help and return to hospital.

However, she could not get better because the Good Shepherd doctor is said to have failed to heal the injury in its entirety.

Matsebula had to undergo another operation at Mbabane Government Hospital. This newspaper contacted the police in October concerning the matter but they responded

by saying they were still investigating. However, no results of the investigations had been released by December last year.

Unfortunate

Matsebula said police have not helped her ever since she encountered the unfortunate situation. "Police did not help me. I was only informed that my matter is still being investigated," she said.

She said she wanted all those that contributed to her current situation to face the wrath of the law because her life was unbearable now. "No one is taking care of my situation. My employers and the police are not taking care of me. I now have to see for myself all the medical needs," she said. Interviewed after being released

from the hospital yesterday, Matsebula said she was taken by members of the Swaziland Economic Empowerment Workers Union (SEIWU) to the Bhunya police. This happened in October last year, when she had gone to attend a meeting of her union, which she said was under the Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA).

Insulted

"Members of SEIWU accused me of having insulted them. They took me to the Bhunya Police Station and told the police that I had insulted them. The police beat me for that until I suffered the injury," she

The police were contacted for comment on the matter yesterday.

Deputy Chief Police Communication and Information Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed knowledge of the matter.

"A case was opened concerning that matter and the docket was taken to the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) for advice," Vilakati said.

Warrant of arrest out for murder suspect Romeo

CHARGED with the murder of his wife, a 45-year-old man cannot be located by the police as he was supposed to appear for his trial at the High Court yesterday morning.

Romeo Sipho Shongwe, who allegedly killed his wife Lindelwa Ginindza (35) by gunning her down with a 303 rifle at Makholweni in Manzini in 2012, has since disappeared as efforts to locate him have been in vain.

Yesterday, witnesses who had come to give evidence in court had to turn back as the matter could not begin and according to investigating officers, they have since applied for his warrant of arrest as he has also defied his bail conditions.

He is currently out on bail which had been fixed at E15 000 by the High Court when he was released in 2012. The weapon had also been brought as an exhibit by the police yesterday while witnesses included the investigating and arresting officers, community police, pathologist and neighbours amongst others.

Shongwe stands accused of killing his 35-year-old wife Lindelwa Ginindza who was allegedly shot dead during a domestic squabble.

The murder occurred at Makholweni in Fairview.

Shongwe, who was unemployed, was reported to have been While at their drinking whisky for the better part of the matrimonial fateful night as residents said loud music was playing.

An argument which Makholweni culminated into a fist fight between the couple is alleged to have

ensued and Shongwe was allegedly heard shouting that he was going to take his gun.

Deafening

In fear for her life, Ginindza fled, but as she tried to escape, her husband is alleged to have shot her in the back next to the chicken coop outside the house, where she collapsed.

Residents had stated that it all began past midnight when they heard deafening gunshots and were shocked at first, but soon remembered that Shongwe was used to firing his rifle in the air. Almost 45 minutes later, one of Shongwe's children reported the incident to a neighbour who called community police to inspect the situation but unfortunately when they arrived at the homestead they found Ginindza uncon-

Shongwe is said to have been found struggling to drag Ginindza's body into a car and was helped by the community police.

He is said to have been so drunk that he asked the community police to drive the car to hospital which they refused to do in fear that she would die along the way.

Leader of the community police of the area Nkosinathi Madzinane stated that they were notified about the incident, but did not know what led to the shooting and Shongwe later handed himself over to the Manzini Police after the incident.

Family planning can end poverty - Hlangusemphi

MINISTER of Economic Planning and Development

Prince Hlangusemphi has said investing in family planning can bring reasonable reductions in the overall numbers of children born. He was speaking yesterday dur-

ing the official launch of the World Population Day commemoration today.

"Family planning creates an economic benefit known as demographic dividend that can boost economic growth, this bonus can only be realised provided the right type of strategic investments are made in young people's education, health, employment and general empowerment," he said.

He went on to add that family planning is also an investment in the health and right of women and couples worldwide.

Critical

"These investments also yield economic and other gains that can push development forward and are thus critical to the success of agenda 2063 on the Africa We Want, agenda 2030 on sustainable Development and His Majesty's vision 2022," the minister explained.

Prince Hlangusemphi added that this year's World Population Day presents an opportunity to take stock as a nation, of successes in meeting the sexual and reproductive health needs of Swazi women and adolescent girls as well as certainty in ensuring that no one is left behind in the journey towards universal access to sexual and reproductive health.

Opposed

"Swaziland is among the leading countries in Africa with the highest proportion of married women who are using a modern method of family planning. In 2014, the country's contraceptive prevalence rate stood at 66 per cent.

Now Swazi women have an average of 3.3 children per woman, as opposed to the average of 7.8 that each woman had in 1966," he revealed.

There is about 15 per cent women in the country who wish to avoid becoming pregnant but are not using any family planning, the minister revealed. The most affected being those that live in rural areas and are from impoverished backgrounds.

Pregnancy

"Currently, the adolescent birth rate stands at 87 per 1 000 girls between the ages of 15-19 years and teenage pregnancy is one of the main factors contributing to school dropouts in the country, related to early sexual debut, with the median age at first time sex at 16 years for girls and 18 years for boys," Dlamini said.

Moreover the minister then reiterated that women who choose family planning are healthier and face a lower risk of maternal death and children born to women who space their pregnancies tend to be healthier and face reduced risks of death in their first five

'Voluntary family planning a human right'

UNITED Nations Fund for Population Activities (UNFPA) Officer in charge Margaret Thwala-Tembe revealed that access to safe voluntary family planning is a human right.

She further added that it is also central to gender equality and women's empowerment.

"However about 214 Million women in developing countries lack safe and effective family planning methods, where most of these women with an unmet demand for contraception live in 69 of the poorest countries in the world, so fulfilling their unmet demand for family planning would saves lives by averting unintended pregnancies and reducing maternal deaths by one third," she said. Planning

She further commended the government of Swaziland for its successful family planning programme as the number of contraception users has grown.

Thwala-Tembe then revealed

that the number of contraception users has grown from 51 per cent in 2007 to 66 per cent in 2014. However, adolescent girls are said to still fall short in the exercise of their sexual and reproductive health rights.

Survey

"The Swaziland Demographic Health Survey found that only 33 per cent of sexually active adolescent girls aged between 15-19 years want to use contraception but for some reasons they are unable to do so, improving access to sexual and reproductive health services for young people will advance Swaziland towards harnessing its demographic dividend," Tembe explained.

Investing

She then re-affirmed on behalf of the organisation that they would collaborate with other UN agencies and remain committed to continue working with the government of Swaziland and other national stakeholders in investing in family planning through their five year joint programme of cooperation (2016-2020).

His matter was before Industrial Court Judge Nkosinathi Nkonyane who postponed it to August 8, for submissions.

According to his papers filed in court, Hlophe argues that he was employed by the company in July, 1992 as a cleaner on a two-months fixed term

However, in 2006, he was verbally employed by Mbongwa Simelane on a permanent basis as he had been continuing to work on contract basis.

In April, 2006 his services were terminated by the company and was replaced with an external person whom he identified as Sibusiso Maseko and

GOVERNMENT is committed in improving the education sector in the country and also implementing Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) Four (4).


Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Education and Training Pat Muir said government has not only invested in quality primary school education and tertiary education, but has injected money in other more education necessities.

He said 97 per cent of primary aged children are now attending school.

"The Swaziland education sector has achieved important realisations in recent years, with the construction of new schools and additional classrooms throughout the country. The ministry has also made improvements to the national curriculum, we are not developing a competency based curriculum and of course better training for our teachers. The allocation of the country's biggest budget to education is over E3 billion which is an

"We have the sector policy which we are now reviewing; we have the Education Sector Strategic Plan and the national education training which we are reviewing. We have a diploma in ECCE offered by Nazarene Teachers College and have expanded access to primary education," he

AS the country continues to battle the shortage of water and food, the most affected are farmers who are unable to harvest crops or feed livestock due to drought effects.

Mafucula is an area in the Lubombo region next to Mhlume.

In some parts of the Lubombo region, water scarcity is very


People in areas like Mafucula

continue to walk long distance to fetch water.


According to a resident of that area Temendvo Shiba, they fetch water in taps that were built by government through the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA), World Vision and other nongovernmental organisations (NGOs). However, she said the taps were damaged and no longer function, thus they then have to travel for over 10 km in search of water in some parts of the area. "Water scarcity is a serious issue at Mafucula

and Tsambokhulu areas," she said. Since 2012, government has been heavily involved specifically with other NGOs preparing for another disaster," She said.

Mafucula's water shortage is being attributed to the heat wave and a lack of rain. It was expected to last until the end of summer because of the of the El Niño effect on the climate. Swaziland Meteorology Services said it was studying the weather patterns and there would be a bit of rain in the 2016/17 season.

Socio-economic inequality rife in rural areas

POVERTY and socio-economic inequalities are aggravating disaster factors in some rural parts of the country.

Socio-economic inequalities not only make poor people more vulnerable but they trap them in a vicious circle of pover-

The current situation in Mafucula reflects that disasters hit the poor the hardest.

"Levels of vulnerabilities are highly dependent upon the economic status of individuals, communities and nations."

The most affected during the El Nino in Swaziland were poor communities. During the El Nino season in 2015/17, Mafucula was amongst the hardest hit in the Lubombo region. This is so because of the socio-economic inequali-

Using the World Bank classification based on gross national income (GNI), over 95 per cent of the people killed by disasters lived in middle and lowincome countries.

The World Bank reports that disasters affect poor countries and poor communities disproportionately.

Developing

"This disproportionate effect on developing countries has many explanations," reads the report.

Lack of development in Mafucula itself contributed to disaster impacts, both because the quality of the construction often is low and building codes.

A country level of development has a direct impact on the damage natural hazards

inflict on populations. Therefore less developed communities suffer most, as they are more frequently hit and more severely affected.

"Since their weak infrastructure and limited capacity for prevention makes them more vulnerable than wealthy communities." Half of the Mafucula population is vulnerable to disasters of social living conditions. Extensive research in the area reflected that the poor occupied dangerous, less desirable locations because the land is cheaper. Poor people tend to live in poorly built and unprotected buildings that are first to collapse in any disaster.

The people from Mafucula area said the 2015/16 losses from disasters were most devastating to the poorest people.

More people live in unsafe settlements

IN FUTURE lot of people will be at risk as the live in unsafe settlements in Swaziland.

According to a guide for journalist covering disaster risk reduction, disasters resulting from such natural hazards as cyclones, windstorms and other related landslides affect people.

"Such weather-related disasters represent about 81 per cent of all events, 72 per cent of all economic losses and 23 per cent of fatalities.

Disabled

The guide further highlights that women, children and disabled are 14 times more likely to die than men during disaster.

"In industrialised countries, more women than men died during the 2003 European heat wave, many more African-American women were affected by hurricane Katrina in 2005 than men," reads the guide.

In many countries, women have subordinate positions, restricted mobility, less educational opportunity, less voice decision-making and poor employment, all of which increase vulnerability.

Govt must develop rural development programmes


MAFUCULA residents have suggested that government establish rural development programmes that reduce the creation of slums and prevent the growth of housing on dangerous slopes or flood plains.

Themba Magagula a resident of Mafucula suggested that government provide the poor with access to land that is safe. "Also involve the poorest communities in building their own capacity to resist disaster since they have more to lose, and to give them greater political stake in the community," he said.

He also appreciated the work by

Swazi Meterology Service, as they were able to give the poorest people full access to early warning systems through the media during Cyclone Dineo in April. Also Magagula applauded National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) for their preparedness, measures and giving the nation financial mechanisms which enabled mostly the poor communities to protect their homes, health and livelihoods.

He also encouraged government and other business entities to develop micro - finance mechanisms that include micro -credit, micro -savings and micro - insurance.

Parents concerned by reports of ritual murders at Maphungwane

PARENTS for pupils attending schools around Maphungwane have raised a serious concern about reports of alleged ritual murderers rooming the area.

In fact, the talks of ritual murders have become so common in the area to the point that an unknown person who would be seen strolling around would undergo vigorous questioning by residents.

The reports have been fuelled by an incident which occurred about a week ago whereby a resident alleged to have survived after four men attempted to

The men are said to have bundled one Sibonkosi Mazibuko into a van before driving off with him in the still

of the night towards Sitsatsaweni forests. The incident has been confirmed by police who are currently conducting an intense investigation.

Parents are now more vigilant with their children. It has been gathered that children have been warned to walk in groups to avoid being taken by the alleged ritual murderers.

A teacher in of the primary schools situated in Maphungwane stated that absenteeism amongst pupils has also increased following the reports.

The teacher said for the past two months, pupils have been reporting that they have been warned of ritual

murders, and were now afraid to walk long distances to school.

Those who find their friends having left for school early and leaving them behind then decide to stay home.

"Such reports have been going on for a while now, and we are really afraid for our children," said one Thabile Matsenjwa, a resident of Sikhonkwaneni.

Matsenjwa disclosed that she normally accompanies her children to school every morning and also fetches them after school.

Meanwhile, the residents have called for visibility of community police along secluded areas.

"The issue of ritual murders is real and we cannot take it lightly and pretend as if nothing happening," said Bhekithemba Maziya of Ndlalane.

NDZANGU UMPHAKATSI WANTS TWO BUCOPHO

RESIDENTS of Ndzangu Umphakatsi are of the view that the area need to have at least two Bucopho due to the size of the area.

The residents say the area is too big to have only one Bucopho.

This was said by Sikelela Khumalo during the civic and voter education exercise this past Saturday.

Khumalo reported to the EBC that some parts of the area seemed to be neglected by the Inkhundla, and this gives them the feeling that they are not

MAN WITH A 23-YEAR-OLD SORE SEEKING HELP

EXCRUCIATING pain, blood, swelling and an inability to walk are things that Solomon Thwala of Jabulani, KaMzizi has become used to.

Thwala has been living with a painful sore since 1994, which appeared soon after he had a bicycle accident on his way home from Nhlangano.

Narrating his ordeal, the 62-yearold man said not only did the accident rob him his life and manhood, the entire right side of his body was numb; he could not even use his right hand.


"After spending about eight months in hospital, I could not feel anything from my waist down, today I have to force myself to stand and to do things like walking to the toilet," Thwala said.

He added that he was further forced to walk unaided after the death of his wife, who was also taking care of him last year, following a heart attack. "She fell face first as she was feeding the grandchildren supper and was confirmed dead by paramedics who we had been called," he said.

Thwala said the sore on his right leg is more painful when it is hot and keeps on reappearing as the years go by.

"It usually heals for some few months and before I know it, it then comes back, more painful and takes its own time to heal again," Thwala said.

He is seeking for doctors' intervention, adding that he has done everything he could to heal the sore and has exhausted the little cash from good Samaritans in vain, since the sore is still there. He is also seeking for a better walking aid

with a good wheelchair as well.

Thwala is asking for a walking aid similar to the one he received in 1994, which he still owns and uses to this day.

"I was given a wheel chair but I struggle to use it, since only one hand functions, pressing buttons like using the bathroom is a task, so I always resort back to the walking aid I have always had, to do tasks around the yard, go to the bathroom and church," he said.

The man added that he is currently taken care of by his granddaughter who is currently doing Form One, in one of the high schools in the area.

"He also lost all her parents and is currently in school because of the orphaned and vulnerable children (OVC) Fund, I am survived by three children, two of which work at the textile firms around Nhlangano, while the other is unemployed," he added.

Thwala revealed that he has not

"I was not aware of his case, since there are a number of people I help from my constituency, however I will track him down and see if there is anything I can help the family with," Dlamini said. He revealed that he will not waste any further time, to track him down as suffering for 23 years in vain is a long enough wapt.

"I am the mouth piece of the people, as they sent me to Parliament, It hurts me to know about such, I will seek the relevant help I can assist him with," the minister assured.

been to hospital in the last year or two since he could not afford the expensive travelling costs.

"I must have a good E400 for me to go to Hlatikulu Government Hospital, which is something I can't afford, I am paralysed and can't be hired anywhere, even if I want to earn a living," he said.

He said he has since ran out of the few medication given to him by DoctorsWithoutBorders in November last year.

"I was given pain medication and rubbing stuff for the sore, it did help, however I have since ran out of it, so I am appealing to any doctor with knowledge of my case, to help me, so I can finally regain my manhood after so many years and work for my family," he appealed.

He mentioned that he has done tests for sugar diabetes and HIV/AIDS, which all came back negative.

Shiselweni Forestry Company equips employees on firefighting

AS it is the fire season, Shiselweni Forestry Company (SFC) has equipped its employees on methods and precautions that must be applied during firefighting.

The company conducted the firefighting drill on Tuesday at the Nhlangano airstrip near the King Sobhuza II Memorial Stadium.

Two aircrafts were part of the exercise whichwere used in the demonstration of aerial firefighting drill.

SFC Forestry Manager Bob Tumber said every year during this period, the aerial firefighting drill would be conducted where employees and management are capacitated on what to expect in case a fire erupts.

"It happens at the beginning of each and every fire season. It's an important programme in our calendar as it's when we equip ourselves with the skills that should be applied in firefighting. We always do this exercise at the airstrip. The aerial firefighting drill involved two aircrafts known as spotter and bomber in the language for the exercise," said Tumber.

The aircraft called spotter, played the role of spotting anything that should be communicated during the firefighting. The aircraft known as bomber carries a load of water used in the extinguishing of fire.

Tumber said usually or all the time, the spotter should always fly ahead of the bomber. The pilot of the spotter is the one that should coordinate or alert the ground crews and the bomber on anything. "A team of airstrip attendants is trained to effectively fill water in the bomber while the company senior staff is also trained on communicating with the spotter. A dire simulation is done and the crew members demonstrate what is expected of them in a fire line," said Tumber.

Tumber said there is always supposed to be a fire boss close to the crew on the fire line and he is the one playing the role of alerting the crew by means of blowing a whistle whenever the bomber is preparing to drop load of water. "Immediately the whistle sound is heard, the crew is expected to make backwards steps from the fire line and lie face down. The whistle is blown again to signal safety which is then where the crew members return to the fire line," said Tumber. Tumber said the safety requirement for the fire crew was to stay a distance away from the fire line whenever the bomber had to drop water. He said such precautions were meant to avoid seeing any of the personnel involved in the exercise not getting hurt or harmed. "The impact of the water load as well as of the bomber can cause havec as heavy branches as well as other materials can fall right on the fire line," said Tumber. It was stressed that all crew members have

to be always on the alert in order to be on safe side when going about their task and have their ears always alert to hear the whistle when blown.

What the crews are expected to do once a whistle is blown

- Should have appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE)
- Safely drift back the fire line and be cautious of branches and other loose material
- Lie facing down, facing the oncoming drop, helmet and goggles on, feet spread apart for better body stability, cover face, and hold any tool you have to your side away from your body
- Swiftly go back to the fire line once the whistle has been blown to indicate the continuation of fire fighting.


But the question to be asked is can we hear it?

Listening ToThe Inner Voice

It is very easy to dismiss intuition yet it is a great gift that needs to be noticed."

Intuitive People Practice Mindfulness

Meditation and other mindfulness practices can be an excellent way to tap into your intuition. "Mindfulness can help you filter out mental chatter, weigh your options objectively, tune into your intuition and ultimately make a decision that you can stand behind completely." Mindfulness can also connect you to your intuition by boosting self-knowledge.

Mindfulness is defined as paying attention to one's current experience in a non-judgmental way, it may help us to better understand our own personalities.

Intuitive People Observe Everything.

"The first thing to do is notice, keep a little journal, and notice when odd things happen," as Burnham says. You'll gain a keen sense for how often coincidences, surprising connections and on the dot intuitions occur in your daily life. In other words, you'll start to tap into your intuition.

Intuitive People ListenTo Their Bodies.

Intuitive people learn to tune into their bodies and heed their "gut feelings." If you have ever started feeling sick to your stomach when you knewsomething was wrong but could not put your finger on what, you understand that intuitions can cause a physical sensation through your body. Our gut feelings are called gut feelings for a reason, research suggests that emotion and intuition are very much rooted in the "second brain" in the gut.

John Maxwell in his 21 Laws of Leadership says that natural leaders get intuition instantly, learned leaders get it eventually and none leaders just go blank on the subject. He says that leaders look at things differently than others, they evaluate everything to the leadership bias. Leaders possess leadership intuition that informs everything they do and it is an inseparable part of who they are. (REPEAT)



These are the two fundamental principles that nations put forward as non-negotiable when engaging with other countries. Sovereignty is all about the pride of protecting one's self-interests as a nation; always willing to act in the interests of one's country and pushing against any undue interference by other countries.


Nations that have been conquered and are under occupation by others would have lost their sovereignty.

Recently, leaders of the African National Congress (ANC) have been emphatic in reciting the idea that there are threats to South Africa's sovereignty by hostile foreign countries and forces.

These threats entail interference with South Africa's sovereignty, and is allegedly not limited to South Africa. In the language of the ANC, African countries that are led by liberation parties are facing destabilisation just because they are still led by progressive political parties with a glorious history.

The list of African countries with sovereignty according to

What do the communists want?



IF the raison d'etre of political parties is to gain state power in order to implement their policies and programmes, the South African Communist Party (SACP) has to be unique among them.

The party's increasingly strident criticism of the ANC, particularly its president, has again raised questions about its future role in South African politics – and its relationship with the governing party.

The SACP, which holds its allimportant national congress this week, has a long history with the ANC. In the past, many of its leaders – such as Govan Mbeki, Moses Kotane, Moses Mabhida, Chris Hani and Joe Slovo - also served in the highest ranks of the ANC, including the powerful national executive committee (NEC).

Even today there is a large number of SACP leaders sitting on the ANC NEC and in the government. They include party General Secretary Blade Nzimande (as Higher Education Minister), his party deputy Jeremy Cronin (Deputy Minister of Public Works), Thulas Nxesi (Sports Minister) and Rob Davies (Trade and Industry Minister). Many others serve in Parliament and elsewhere as ANC representatives

As with party leaders, most SACP members to this day hold dual membership with the ANC.

And in addition to providing an important link with the old socialist bloc for political and military support, the party is often credited with critically influencing the ANC's own political thinking. It continues to regard itself as the "vanguard" of the tripartite alliance's National Democratic Payalutian.

In the days of the struggle against apartheid, the relationship was premised on the party's deference to the ANC – which was the unifying front for all South Africans who opposed apartheid, irrespective of their social formation or class. But the changed conditions, in which the ANC has to govern in

the interests of all South Africans not just its members and political allies, has brought to the fore the fundamental ideological differences between the party and the ANC.

Apart from government policy, conflict between the SACP and the ANC has been over the so-called "sins of incumbency", particularly corruption in the ANC and the state.

The SACP has been among the most outspoken critics of malfeasance in the government, particularly in public entities such as the SABC, Eskom, Prasa and PetroSA.

Rescidnent

It has called for the rescindment of the citizenship of the Gupta family – President Jacob Zuma's avowed friends, who stand accused of trying to capture the South African state.

To cap it all, the SACP has demanded that Zuma himself resign. As things stand, the SACP seems to be more in tune with the national mood than the ANC regarding the sorry state of the country and Zuma's role in that.

With relations between the party and the ANC being at a historical low, the obvious question is why SACP members and leaders are staying in the ANC?

There might be the sentimental matter born of the fact that the two organisations, sharing membership, together weathered tough times during the anti-apartheid struggle. Yet communists are not meant to be ruled by emotion, but rather by what they call the "objective conditions".

Party leaders might say that by staying in the ANC they stand a better chance of preventing it from falling into the clutches of capitalists or potential state captors – perhaps even nudging it down the socialist path.

However, their recent track record on that score would suggest the contrary.

Thabo Mbeki's 2007 warning to SACP leaders, to desist from trying to turn the ANC into a socialist party, must still be ringing in their ears. And since then the ANC has remained a "broad church" comprising anything from communists to capitalists to state looters and African nationalists. Even crypto-tribalists.

In some instances, this has led to violence between ANC and SACP members, resulting in a number of murders, particularly in KwaZulu-Natal and Mpumalanga. Recently, death threats have been made against SACP second deputy General Secretary Solly Mapaila (who has been the party's chief mouthpiece against Zuma and state corruption).

What's beyond doubt is that the SACP's presence in the ANC and its government has not prevented the emergence of what the party calls "parasitic patronage networks" that feed off the state.

And might there be political benefit to the SACP in continuing as little more than a handmaiden to the ANC, and campaigning for it during elections?

None that's apparent. By having its members in government and ANC structures, the party takes equal blame for everything the ANC does wrong. In the electorate's eyes, it gets tainted by the bad PR around the ANC president.

Worse, its members in the government have been assigned tasks which go against the party's own ideological beliefs. For instance, Cronin, as deputy minister of Transport, was deployed to defend the unpopular etolls in Gauteng. The nub here was that the government had taken an existing public road network, improved it (as is the state's job), then charged the public for using it.

Similarly, SACP deputy chair Nxesi,

Similarly, SACP deputy chair Nxesi, while minister of Public Works, and was given the unenviable job of politically cleaning up the mess from the Nkandla fiasco.

For their troubles, SACP leaders are required to fall in line with ANC discipline and "democratic centralism", which frown on members criticising the party in public.

And so, if party members spend most of their time being "loyal and disciplined" ANC cadres, who will champion the SACP's stated programme to bring about socialism?

Were the party to stand alone and start articulating its vision to the public, it might have to present the nuts and bolts of that socialist dispensation.

Would it be like Cuba, which swiftly accepted capitalist Barack Obama's hand of friendship? Would it be like Venezuela, where the socialist experiment has led to prolonged civil strife? Or would it be like China, which has embraced the global capitalist order and is an adept player therein?

The greatest risk for the party in going it alone would be a possible electoral annihilation. Inversely, if it gains a foothold in the legislatures, likely becoming one of the many minority parties, it might be in a stronger position to bargain tactically with the ANC on matters like policy direction.

Its members and public representatives, accounting to one party not two, would be freed to pursue their party programme as distinct from the ANC's - even where it is diametrically opposed to the ANC's. Plus, they might not have to pay the political price they currently do every time the ANC shoots itself in the foot.

Going it alone and winning electoral support in its own right would answer critics who aver that, for fear of being rejected by the South African voter, the SACP chooses to hang on to the political coat tails of the ANC.

Rank-and-file pressure to stand alone has been building up in the SACP for a while, often held back by leadership. Could the wind blow in its favour this time around?

ruption taking pace in South Africa, local authorities are folding their hands and doing nothing.

the ANC include, for example, Robert Mugabe's regime in Zimbabwe.

The suspicion that African countries with a messianic history are experiencing a threat to their sover-eignty – a threat posed by a Western driven agenda of regime change – seems to be harboured by countries that are becoming increasingly corrupt, if not corrupt already.

This raises the question as to who exactly is responsible for threaten-

ing countries led by liberation parties such as South Africa.

South Africa's case shows that the very same people who are alleging that Western forces are behind this phenomenon mostly undermine the country's sovereignty themselves. South Africa is losing its sovereignty in a very strange way; a way that does not involve foreign forces but rather the ANC leaders in government

Our government's failure to initiate local investigations into individuals and entities engaged in corruption leaves no option but for international or foreign bodies to investigate such matters. There is a growing trend where foreign countries investigate allegations of corruption that have taken place in South Africa.

Foreign governments undertake these investigations because companies alleged to have corrupted South African officials come from their countries.

The unfortunate part of this scenario is that while these countries are involved in investigations of cor-

TRANSNET and Swaziland Railways (SR) have agreed to package the 146-km 'Swazi link' Greenfield line between Lothair, in South Africa, and Sidvokodvo, as a public-private partnership (PPP) and may release an international tender for a 20 to 25-year concession by October.

According to Engineering News Online, Transnet Chief Executive Officer Siyabonga Gama said the operating model and funding structure were still to be finalised.

He said there was also potential to integrate the special purpose vehicle (SPV) into various other cross border freight logistics plans involving Botswana and Mozambique.

"Swaziland Railways and Transnet will now ring fence the venture as a SPV, in which the two utilities will hold a minority 49 per cent, with the 51 per cent balance to be owned by private investors. Should the SPV materialise as planned, it would be the largest PPP under-

taken to date by either utility and will be aligned with Transnet's private sector participation framework, which is operating alongside the group's rolling E277.8 billion market demand strategy," he said.

Gama said it was premature to confirm when exactly

the international tender would be released, as various discussions and processes were still underway.

"However, it is possible that the

tender will be released in either September or October for adjudication or early 2018. Depending on responses, the winning bidder could begin construction by the middle of next year. The project is expect-

ed to involve a 30month construction period," he said.

Gama said the route for the E12-billion to E16-billion project had already been determined following a detailed feasibility study and the two state-owned companies

were currently in the process of acquiring land on both sides of the border, while upgrading associated infrastructure. "Both funding partners, as well as companies with established logistics capabilities will be targeted in the tender, who will include volume guarantees. The initial general-freight volumes set aside for the SPV are currently transported on Transnet's coal line to Richards Bay, in KwaZulu-Natal. However, the call for bids is also likely to outline potential road volumes that could be transferred across to the rail link over the concession period," he said.

"About five-million tons a year of general freight would be guaranteed, while details could be provided for displacing a further sixmillion tons a year from road to rail over the short- to medium-term. Over the full concession period, it is anticipated that volumes could rise to above 30-million tons," he added.

Gross official reserves slid to six month-low

THE country's gross official reserves slid to a six month-low of E6.9 billion at the end of

A comparison of data reported by the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) of the past six months reflects that the country's reserves had been on a swing trajectory.

Reserves opened at E8.2 billion in January backed by the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) quarterly inflow. They decreased to E7.6 billion in February, further decreased to E7.3 billion in March, increased again to E8.2 billion in April backed by the SACU quarterly inflow, then decreased to E7.4 billion in May and finally slid to E6.9 billion by end of June.

According to the CBS money and banking statistics report May/June, at this level the reserves consequently represented a six months

low import cover of 3.2 months.

"Annually the reserves receded by 16.9 per cent," reported the CBS.

However, the report said at this level, the reserves continued to be above the international recommendation of three months of imports.

On the other hand, the report said net government balances held by other depository corporations decelerated by 64.4 per cent compared with the previous month to close the month under review at E484.9 million.

"This development was due to a drawdown on government deposits held with the banking system," said the report.

On a monthly comparison, government deposits fell by 18.1 per cent, offsetting a 0.2 per cent growth in claims on government. When compared to the same period the previous year, net government balances receded by 75.7 per cent.

Meanwhile, the CBS reported that credit extended to the private sector increased by 1.2 per cent from the previous month to settle at E12.8 billion at the end of May.

The CBS said the enhanced performance in credit to the private sector was mainly due to credit to households and non-profit institutions serving households (NPISH) and credit to businesses over the month under review.

'However, credit to other sectors depicted a contraction over the same review period. Year on-year, private sector credit grew by 6.5 per cent. Credit extended to businesses amounted to E5.8 billion at the end of May 2017, depicting growth of 1.3 per cent from the previous month. The rise in credit to businesses was predominantly absorbed by these sectors: real estate (3.2 per cent), distribution and tourism (2.5 per cent) agriculture and forestry (1.9 per cent)," said the report.

Credit extended to other sectors receded by 2.7 per cent month-on-month to reach E1.2 billion at the end of May.

"The reduction in credit to other sectors was observed in the state and local government (-24.6 per cent) and other financial corporations (-9.0 per cent). Credit to the public non-financial corporations on the other hand depicted a rise of 18.3 per cent when compared with the previous month," reported the CBS.

Bank's liquidity firms by 7.7 %, edges at E4.3bn

THE liquidity of local banks has recently increased by 7.7 per cent to close at E4.3 billion as of the end of June.

Liquidity is a measure of the ability and ease with which bank assets can be converted to cash. According to the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) money and banking statistics May/June report, the rise was on account of other depository corporations' cash holdings, balances with the central bank and their investment in gov-

ernment securities over the month under review. "The banks' liquidity ratio therefore closed at 31.2 per cent, higher than the 30.3 per cent recorded at the end of April 2017," said the report.

Compared annually, banks' domestic liquid assets increased by 43.1 per cent.

The report also stated that broad money supply (M2) reached E15.4 billion at the end of May higher than the E14.7 billion recorded at the end of April.

The CBS said this development was in line with the growth in credit extended to the private sector over the month of May.

"As a result, both components of broad money increased over the month of May," said the

Compared over the year, the CBS reported that broad money supply expanded by 12.9 per cent. On another note, quasi money supply (M1) amounted to E10.3 billion at the end of May, expanding by 7.4 per cent on a month-on-month

The report said the growth was observed in both components of quasi money, with time deposits accelerating by 8.5 per cent to E8.5 bil-



lion and savings deposits by 2.5 per cent to E1.8

"M1 increased by 0.8 per cent over the month under review to reach E5.1 billion. An analysis of the components of M1 revealed that trans-

ferable deposits grew by 1.7 per cent over the month to E4.6 billion, whilst currency outside depository corporations shrank by 6.1 per cent to E557.8 million at the end of May 2017," said

Funds not allowed to commute full members pension

AS of March 17, the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA) halted approvals of any applications by retirement funds to commute more than the statutory one third of the fund members' full pension.

This was through the Circular No.1/2017 which was endorsed by FSRA Chief Executive Officer Sandile Dlamini.

In the circular, the FSRA said pursuant to the issuance of Circular No.1/2009, the FSRA noted that there was a continuous undesirable practice where fund members commute their full pension as opposed to commuting the allowable one third pension pay out as envisaged by the amended Income Tax Order,

The authority said this practice set wrong precedent and had impacted on the administration, functioning and solvency of funds.

"The relevant section of the Income Tax order hinges on the provision of Section 2 (a) which provides that: Provided that the commissioner may approve a fund subject to such limitations or conditions as may determine, but shall not approve a fund unless in respect of the year of assessment in

question, he is satisfied that there the fund is a permanent fund bona fide established for the purpose of providing annuities for employers on retirement from employment...the commissioner shall not approve a fund unless, in respect of the year of assessment in question, he is satisfied that the rules of the fund provide that no more than one third of the total value of the annuity to which an employee becomes entitled may be commuted for a single payment, except where annual amount of such annuity does not exceed one thousand five hundred Emalangeni." explained the FSRA.

The authority reminded trustees and all fund stakeholders that it was imperative for them to align themselves with the intention of the Retirement Funds Act, 2005 and the purpose of a pension fund, which is to provide retirement income security for the remaining life of the member.

THE ROLE OF THE FSRA IN COMPLIANCE, ENFORCEMENT



One of the key roles of FSRA is to ensure that all non-bank financial services providers conduct their business according to the principles of best practice and uphold standards of market conduct as per Section 46 of the FSRA Act, 2010.

Enforcement

The FSRA enforces corrective action where a financial services provider fails or is unable to comply with or contravenes a requirement imposed by the Act, or any other applicable financial services law. If a financial services provider contravenes the above mentioned laws, FSRA may in terms of Section 67 of the Act;

- Issue a written warning;
- Direct the financial services provider to do a specified act or refrain from doing a specified act within a specified period in order to comply with the relevant provision; or;
- Impose an administrative penalty under Section 68 of the FSRA Act, 2010.

Before an administrative penalty is imposed, FSRA will give the financial services provider notice of its intention to do so specifying the grounds and the facts supporting the charge brought against it. The financial services provider will be given sufficient time to adequately prepare its written submissions to support its oral submissions during the hearing.

Powers of the Authority

Section 6 of the Act empowers FSRA to take a range of actions in order to apply appropriate enforcement and to effectively discharge its functions. FSRA has the power to issue the following directives when a financial services provider has compliance issues;

- Restrict the entity from conducting business;
- Direct the entity to reinforce its financial position;
- Bar individuals acting in certain capacities from such roles in future;
 and
- Suspend or revoke any license issued under any financial services law.

Monitoring

The routine monitoring of financial services providers is conducted through both offsite and onsite monitoring. The findings of the exercise guides FSRA on the corrective action to take.

Mandated

The FSRA is mandated in terms of Section 67 of the FSRA Act, 2010 to take corrective measures against non-compliant persons operating within the non-bank financial services sector.

The process of initiating corrective measures entails the convening of a hearing wherein the non-compliant person is given an opportunity prior to the imposition of a corrective measure; to state their case regarding their non-compliance.

The FSRA uses a number of corrective measures in order to encourage the compliance of persons who have been found to have contravened provisions of the non-bank financial services laws.

Suspended Sentence

The effect of a suspended sentence is that; where a person has been found to be guilty of breaching a provision of the non-bank financial services laws the effective imposition of a corrective measure is suspended on condition that; should the person or entity be found to have committed the same offence within a specified time frame the corrective measure previously waived would be reimposed. A person or entity who is under a suspended sentence imposed by the FSRA is still deemed to be fit and proper to operate in the industry, subject to the non-commission of a similar offence within a specified period of time.

Debarment and Revocation of license to Operate

The FSRA Act, 2010 lists in Section 46 of the Act, the standards of market conduct that all regulated persons are expected to uphold in the conduct of their business. These standards include:

 Acting honestly and fairly in the best interest of stakeholders and the integrity of the market.

 Acting with due skill, care and diligence.

Avoiding conflict of interest.

 Maintaining adequate financial resources to meet business commitments.

 Adequate protection and segregation of stakeholder's assets in their care.

Requirements

Failure to uphold these standards of market conduct as well as non-compliance with other regulatory requirements which point to the inability and/or refusal to abide by regulatory requirements as prescribed in legislation is likely to lead to a person being declared non desirable person and eventually result in the debarment and revocation of a license to operate in the industry.

However, before a corrective action is taken, FSRA considers the full circumstances of each case. The following factors may be considered depending on the facts of each case;

- Nature of the breach;
- Conduct after breach;
- Previous regulatory record; and
 Guidance issued by FSRA.

After corrective action against a financial services provider is taken, FSRA monitors the compliance with legal requirements and sound busi-

ness practices by:

- Meeting with the management of the financial services provider to outline concerns and discuss remedial actions;
- Instructing the financial services provider to provide an acceptable business plan that reflects appropriate remedial measures that will rectify problems within a specified time frame:
- Enhancing monitoring of the financial services provider by requiring more frequent reporting and more detailed information.
- Monitoring the progress of remedial actions via reporting requirements, follow up inspections or both;
- Taking control of the assets of the entity if statutory conditions exist and if there is an immediate threat to the safety of customers and creditors.

Decision

After the hearing, a decision is handed and if the financial services provider is aggrieved by the administrative penalty issued against it, it may request for an internal review or may appeal to the Appeals Tribunal in terms of Section 80 of the FSRA Act, 2010. OR Tambo 'follow-home' heist sees couple robbed of R50k

CAPE TOWN - A couple returning from a trip and landing at OR Tambo International Airport over the weekend have been robbed of luggage worth an estimated "R50 000 and some \$7 000 in cash".

The alleged 'follow-home' robbery took place in Centurion on Saturday night July 8, after the couple left the Johannesburg airport, according to the Rekord Centurion.

The report quotes police spokesperson Captain Dave Miller, who states the robbery occurred on the "corner of Rietvlei Dam Street and Delmas Road", after "five armed men in a silver Mercedes forced the couple to stop".

Miller says the couple was not injured, but their cellphones were also stolen during the robbery.

Attempts to track the robbers via the cellphones by security forces responding to the situation "lead to Hammnaskraal" but the signal was eventually lost.

An investigation into the incident continues.

SA's Minister of Police, Fikile Mbalula is expected to visit the OR Tambo International Airport on Monday, July 10 at 10:00am.

Mbalula will meet with the South African Police Service Management, Home Affairs, State Security and the Ekurhuleni Metropolitan Police Departments at the airport regarding the safety and security challenges at the airport.

This latest weekend robbery comes as OR Tambo has warned travellers to be vigilant as alleged 'spotter' syndicates are being investigated across the various companies operating at the airport.

ACSA has confirmed it is working with authorities to curb the current crime wave around SA's busiest airport.

Attempt

OR Tambo International issued a statement previously after yet another cargo heist attempt took place at the airport on Saturday July 1.

This followed a Carte Blanche investigation into alleged spotters working within the airport to identify travellers with high-value bags or goods.

Aired on Sunday June 25, the actuality programme interviewed an alleged spotter as he detailed how people working at the airport are helping criminals identify tourists, businessmen and even locals as they pass through OR Tambo International.

On Friday July 7, EFF leader Julius Malema weigh in on the concern, calling the airport a "playground for criminals" and the crime situation an "embarrassment".

ACSA has since met with the various stakeholders involved in the safety and security of the airport operations and has confirmed it is working through its Public Safety and Security staff to identify these alleged "airport spotters" believed to be alerting criminals behind follow-home robberies.

ACSA says it is supporting the South African Police Services Crime Prevention Plan in identifying the alleged spotters.

Hesitate

Leigh Gunkel-Keuler, spokesperson for OR Tambo International Airport says, "We will not hesitate to take decisive action when we identify any person helping the criminals, irrespective of whether these spotters are employed by Airports Company South Africa or one of the many service providers operating at the airport."

An estimated 35 000 people are employed air-port wide, across airline companies, ground handling companies, cargo operators, security companies, retail concessionaires, hotels, public transport operators and government agencies. Further, only about 10 per cent to 15 per cent of people working at the airport are directly employed by ACSA.

"In addition, we continue to work closely with the SAPS on a variety of measures, including surveillance and



intelligence work, to identify the spotters and the criminals."

ACSA is also working with the travel and tourism sector so that it remains engaged on the issue of crime - having met with the Tourism Business Council concerning the spike in this crime trend.

The northern part of the Sinai Peninsula, bordering Gaza and Israel, is home to a powerful Islamic State affiliate that has carried out a number of attacks in recent years, mainly targeting security forces and the region's Christian minority. Women suffocates new born twins

HARARE - A Zimbabwean woman, 29. allegedly suffocated her new born twins in a plastic bag, placed them inside a 20 litre bucket of water, before accusing a traditional midwife of having killed them, reports say. According to NewsDay, Gladys Tsvuura from Dzivaresekwa in western Harare, pleaded not guilty to concealment of birth charges when she appeared before Magistrate Josephine Sande last week. State witness Shupikai Mbimbi, told the court that Tsvuura gave birth to twins on May 19 while she was alone inside her rented cabin home. It was revealed that after she had given birth to the twins, she wrapped them with a plastic bag, placed them inside a 20 litre bucket of water and hid it in her house.

Mugabe in Singapore for medical check


HARARE - Zimbabwe's 93-yearold President Robert Mugabe is in Singapore for a "routine medical check-up", state media reported Sunday.

"President Mugabe last Friday left the country for Singapore for a routine medical check-up," the Sunday Mail newspaper reported.

The paper said the veteran ruler is expected back in Zimbabwe mid-

Mugabe's medical trips to the Southeast Asia city state have become more frequent in recent years. His previous visit was in May, also said to be for a "routine medical checkup". In 2011 and 2014 he had eye surgery in a hospital in Singapore.

Mugabe now walks with difficulty and sometimes dozes off during meetings.



His health has been the subject of increased speculation in recent years and authorities in March arrested two journalists over a report alleging that he was "in bad shape." In 2016, the government had to deny that he had died abroad during his annual vacation.

Mugabe has declined to name a successor and his ruling ZANU-PF party has been riven by factionalism for years.

Despite Mugabe's advanced age, the party last year endorsed him as its candidate for the 2018 general elections. The leader is not the only African president currently abroad for treatment for an undisclosed condition. Nigeria's Muhammadu Buhari has been in London since May 7, and his lengthy absence has caused political uncertainty in Africa's most populous nation.

Angola's President Jose Eduardo dos Santos recently spent a month in Spain for medical treatment and yesterday officials announced that he had gone back for what was described as a "private visit".

Zimbabwe is in the process investors keen to grow the of setting up SEZs, initially in Harare, Bulawayo and Victoria Falls. The zones will offer investors incentives, including exemption from some provisions of the labour law and black economic empowerment rules. Mpofu told the paper that he thought the Canadian firm, which he didn't name, was joking when he first received an inquiry from them. That was before he realised that medical cannabis production was big business.

"This company is from Canada and it's one of the biggest con-

glomerates in that country and they are producing cannabis for medical purposes under strict conditions," he said.

"I don't see anything wrong nd I think if we legalise (production of) mbanje we will benefit medically because it is used for pain killers such as morphine," he added.

Under Zimbabwe's laws the possession or cultivation of cannabis is illegal, punishable by jail. In 2015 a Harare man -who was found by police to be growing small quantities of marijuana at home, apparently to treat a rare bone ailment - was jailed for 12 months. according to The Herald.


ODINGA CHECKED FOR SIGNS OF FOOD POISONING

GERMANY - President Jacob Zuma says he's received encouraging feedback from the International Monetary Fund while at the G20 meeting in Germany.

SACP to consider fighting election outside of alliance

JOHANNESBURG -The SACP heads to its 14th congress this week, where it will discuss whether to break away from the ANC and contest elections on its own.

The fractured state of the ANC

The fractured state of the ANC and allegations of state capture have induced serious discussions in the left axis of the ruling alliance about the possibility of the SACP contesting for state power.

This is not the first time the issue has arisen. The discussion was first initiated in 2005, when the party was confronted with what it termed the "1996 class project" under former president Thabo Mbeki, the aftermath of

which was the party siding with Jacob Zuma when he ousted Mbeki. Second Deputy General Secretary Solly Mapaila yesterday confirmed this was still on the agenda for the upcoming congress and will be discussed in conjunction with the reconfiguration of the alliance with the ANC and COSATU-an important aspect of the debate.

Some provinces have already decided that the SACP should go solo at the polls in 2019, while others were undecided, Mapaila said. It is likely to be a hot debate at the congress. In its current document on state power and elections released in November 2016, the SACP con-

cluded the political situation was fluid and much would depend on the outcome of the ANC's 2017 national conference. Mapaila said the SACP would not be talking about ANC succession or pronouncing on who the party thinks should be the next president of the governing party. This is despite its other alliance partner, COSATU, coming out publicly to endorse Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa. Mapaila said the SACP would not endorse specific candidates, but had an interest in who became leader as that person ultimately becomes the leader of the alliance.

The report said the department failed to maintain and acquire functional equipment, provide access to adequate oncology services and monitor the health needs of oncology patients in the province.

DA MPL Imran Keeka lodged a formal complaint with the SAHRC in 2016 after it came to light that cancer patients did not have access to proper healthcare services; including severe shortages of staff and a lack of functional health technology machines for screening, diagnosing and treating cancer.

In a statement on Sunday, Kopane said the lack of services to cancer patients has potentially resulted in the deaths of no less than 300 cancer patients in the province.

driver to be charged with 18 charges of culpable homicide

JOHANNESBURG – The driver of a truck involved in a horror crash in Mpumalanga today is expected to be charged with 18 charges of culpable homicide, the Road Traffic Management Corporation said.

Six of the 18 mineworkers who died in the collision were buried tis past Saturday, the agency said in a statement on Sunday.

The Mozambican truck driver was expected to appear in the Belfast Magistrate Court yesterday. Last Tuesday, ER24 spokesperson Russel Meiring said when emergency services arrived at the scene, a damaged bus was found on its side on the roadside at about 07:30, and the truck in the middle of the road a short distance away.

Several passengers were found lying trapped inside the bus while others were walking around on the scene.

Meiring said several were also found lying trapped under the overturned bus.

16 people were confirmed dead at the scene, while two others died due to their injuries in hospital. *News24*

COULD YOUR OLD RECORD PLAYER
BE WORTH HUNDREDS

LONDON - A renewed love affair with vinyl is creating a surge in demand for old turntables and record players. It means equipment that was thrown away as obsolete junk just a few years ago can fetch hundreds – sometimes even thousands – of pounds.

Here, Toby Walne goes for a spin to find how to make money and great music from vintage hi-fi.

Invest in a classic turntable
Sales of vinyl passed three million for the

first time in 25 years this year.

Enthusiasts keen to find something suitable to spin their new discs on are turning to old players that were previously just cluttering up the house or collecting dust in the attic.

The most sought-after equipment is now viewed as a shrewd investment – rising in value as collectors scramble for pieces that survived the cull of the decades when vinyl was deemed out-of-date. Steve Ansell, owner of vintage hi-fi specialist Hifi Hangar in Bordon, Hampshire, says: "There has been a real surge of interest."



WAYS TO SAVE MONEY, BOOST YOUR SAVINGS

WITH a few pounds in your pocket you can buy a vintage turntable where the music sounds better than most CD players — a format which is now far more likely to be viewed as obsolete in the future.

'Classic hi-fi offers better value than new equipment that is not always built to last as it once was. You are unlikely to lose money by investing in a quality turntable—and have the added return of enjoying great sounding music.'

He suggests a £200 budget is a good place to start for a decent sounding quality turntable. This includes a Thorens 150 Mk II introduced in 1969 and the Ariston RD11 that came out in 1971.

Others such as a Goldring Lenco GL75 from 1969 and Rega Planar 3 from 1977 can sell for similar prices but may require you to invest separately in a tone arm and cartridge, the parts that hold the all important stylus needle, to push the final bill up by £100 or more.

At the top end of the price scale is the Linn Sondek LP12 launched in 1972. The Glasgow-based firm is still going strong.

You can spend £25,000 on a limited edition LP12 – such as a 40th anniversary turntable that had a plinth made from Highland Park distillery oak casks.

Even if you buy an early Linn Sondek



without tone arm or cartridge, you will not see any change from £1,000 thanks to a huge following that always keeps prices high.

Ansell says: 'There was a huge explosion in the number of manufacturers making quality turntables that started in the 1950s. Today you have a vast range of choice – many are fantastic value.'

The Garrard 301 is another highend turntable with legendary heritage since its launch in 1954. Grey enamel examples can be picked up for £800 but you should also budget at least a further £250 for a quality tone arm, such as an old SME 3009, and further £200 for a cartridge, such as a Shure V15.

Other turntable makers whose val-

ues rarely fall include Pink Triangle

– relaunched as The Funk Firm in

2005, Pro-Ject and Michell Engineering.

The latter's founder, John Michell, designed a transcriptor turntable in 1964 that appeared in the 1972 Stanley Kubrick movie 'A Clockwork Orange.' Pristine examples can sell for £2,000 or more. The turntable can be sold as just the plinth, motor and platter. You then separately buy a tone arm and cartridge - the latter contains the stylus needle that reads the music in the vinyl grooves. A specialist dealer can offer advice on finding the right balance. These include Hifi Hangar, London-based Audio Gold and Sevenoaks Sound and Vision. Trading websites include Hifi In Touch and Hifi For Sale.

CONSIDER VINTAGE EXPERTS

KEY to the appeal of a classic turntable is that even if the equipment is half a century old, it will still be compatible with modern hi-fi speakers and amplifiers – enabling you to get the best from vintage separates.

Yet many audiophiles believe that often an amplifier of a comparable age to the turntable can make a great match.

Amps that use valves offer warmth marely found in modern microchips and can produce a lush sound sought by many vinyl lovers.

In the era from the 1950s to the 1980s when the ability to play vinyl was a standard part of a stereo system, a 'phono stage' – often referred to as a 'phono pre-amp' – was included in the

KEY to the appeal of a classic turntable amp. This boosts the signal from the turntable.

Because modern amps are more used to amplifying the signals from CD players and streamed music, you often have to buy a separate phono stage box that plugs into the new amp to help boost the turntable signal.

Modern

This extra costs anything from £50 upwards – and modern hi-fi owners should always budget for this.

Robin Brunson, of vintage hi-fi dealer Audio Gold in Finsbury Park, North London, says: "A trusty old amp like a late 1970s Pioneer SA-8800 with lots of great retro knobs and dials can cost £300.

It offers fabulous value for money compared with modern equipment and is a real nostalgic treat."

Investments

Later amps from the 1980s – such as those by Creek, NAD, Arcam and Audio Lab – can also be solid investments for driving a classic turntable. You should budget at least £200 for a decent old amp.

Speakers of the era can also blast out an authentic sound but unfortunately, unlike other hi-fi separates, are not so easy to repair if they break.

Cassette decks have a limited appeal for most listeners but there are legendary classics – such as a 1980s Nakamichi Dragon – selling for up to £1,000.

Turntables are not to be confused with record players – which differ in that

SOME VINYL RECORDS ARE BECOMING INVESTMENTS

THE rebirth of vinyl has been helped by a new generation of music lovers – encouraged by modern musicians such as Ed Sheeran, Fleet Foxes and Royal Blood who release their latest LPs on vinyl.

Favourites such as David Bowie, The Beatles, Pink Floyd and Fleetwood Mac have also rereleased their best albums on vinyl in recent years.

But it is not just new vinyl that is in demand – particularly rare and sought-after old records that once sold for just a few pence in charity shops or at car boot sales are now becoming an investment.

A 1958 seven-inch single That'll Be The Day by The Quarrymen is listed as the most valuable record at £100,000.

John Lennon, Paul McCartney and George Harrison recorded it

in a booth on 78rpm acetate before they became The Beatles.


Other vinyl treasures include a 1977 release of God Save The Queen by The Sex Pistols on A&M Records.

The punk rock band was dropped for bad behaviour and all but nine copies of the 25,000 original singles that were pressed survived being destroyed – and are now worth £8,000 each.

Steve Ansell, of Hifi Hangar, believes the appeal of vinyl is not only the quality of the music but also the packaging. He says: "Playing a record is a ritual.

There is something special about picking up vinyl, removing it from the sleeve and playing it – often while reading sleeve notes or lyrics.

This has a timeless appeal that you do not get from streaming or CDs."



they have the amp within the unit. Among those, the most soughtafter old record players are the small suitcase-sized designs many people grew up with in their bedroom.

The sound quality can be dubious but the appeal is nostalgic. Dansette is one of the most soughtafter brands, whose heyday was in the 1950s and 1960s.

Favourites like the Dansette Monarch or Bermuda can sell for £500 in pristine condition – but less than £100 if showing their age. **Daily Mail**

Huge fire at London's Camden market

LONDON - Seventy firefighters battled a large fire in a building in London's popular Camden Lock Market yesterday morning, the London Fire Brigade said.

The emergency service said it had also sent 10 fire engines to the scene, near a nightclub and a covered market.

There were no reports of casualties.

"The first, second and third floors, plus the roof, of a building within the market are alight," the London Fire Brigade said on Twitter.

Images shared on social media showed tall flames and a burnt-out building at the north London market, which is popular with Londoners and tourists.

"The fire was moving very fast," witness Joan Ribes, 24, told the Press Association. He said the fire "was flying through the air

to the surrounding areas".

More needs to be done- Fallon

LONDON - Britain's Defence Minister Michael Fallon praised Iraq last past Sunday for defeating the Islamic State group in Mosul, but warned that more has to be done to combat the jihadists.

Earlier on Sunday Iraq announced victory against ISIS in the northern city, the country's second largest, from where the group declared a self-styled caliphate three years ago.

Battles have raged for months, leaving thousands dead and wounded, while nearly a million people have fled.

"I congratulate Prime Minister [Haider] Abadi, and the Iraqi forces who have been fighting on the ground with great bravery and care against a brutal opponent," Fallon said in a statement. AFP

Trump's son met Russian lawyer for Clinton information

WASHINGTON - The son of US President Donald Trump agreed to meet a Kremlin-linked lawyer during the 2016 election campaign after being promised damaging information about Hillary Clinton, the New York Times reported.

Trump's then-campaign Chairperson, Paul Manafort, and his son-in-law, Jared Kushner, also attended the meeting at Trump Tower on June 9, 2016, two weeks after Trump won the Republican nomination, the Times reported on Sunday, citing three advisers to the White House.

In a statement quoted by the Times and later made available to media outlets, Donald Trump Jr acknowledged meeting with Russian lawyer Natalia Veselnitskaya.

"After pleasantries were exchanged, the woman stated that she had information that individuals connected to Russia were funding the Democratic National Committee



and supporting Ms Clinton," the statement said.

Clinton was the 2016 Democratic presidential nominee. "Her statements were vague, ambiguous and made no sense. No details or supporting information was provided or even offered. It quickly became clear that she had no meaningful information."

Trump Jr said Veselnitskaya

then turned the conversation to the adoption of Russian children and a US law blackisting Russians linked to alleged human-rights abuses.

President Trump was "not aware of and did not attend" the meeting, Mark Corallo, a spokesperson for Trump's legal team, said in an emailed statement.

Trump Jr said he was asked to attend the meeting "with an individual who I was told might have information helpful to the campaign" at the request of an acquaintance he knew from the 2013 Miss Universe pageant. "I asked Jared and Paul to attend, but told them nothing of the substance," he said. "The meeting lasted approximately 20 to 30 minutes," he said. "As it ended, my acquaintance apologised for taking up our time. That was the end of it and there was no further contact or followup of any kind. My father knew nothing of the meeting or these events." Aljazeera



Frenchman, Belgians charged over terror

PARIS - A 42-year-old Frenchman suspected of plotting attacks with two Belgian brothers was charged with terror offences this past Sunday, a judicial source said. The suspect was identified as Salah Ghemit, who was known to authorities before his arrest, and was charged with arms possession and having links to extremist groups, the source said.

Ghemit is believed to be connected to Akim and Khalid Saouti, two brothers charged in Brussels last Wednesday with belonging to a "terrorist group". They were believed to be planning an attack with a large stash of weapons including Kalashnikov rifles. *AFP*

Tillerson's nostalgia for old oil life

ISTANBUL - US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson, the former chief executive of Exxon Mobil, expressed nostalgia for his former life as an oilman while picking up an industry award in Istanbul this past Sunday. Tillerson, often criticised for failing to communicate enough with the media and for leaving important State Department posts empty, was attending the opening of the World Petroleum Congress. He waxed lyrical over his old job while being honoured with the Dewhurst Award for his contribution to the oil and gas industry. *AFP*

Venezuela marks 100 days of protest

CARACAS -Venezuela hit its 100th day of anti-government protests Sunday, one day after its



most prominent political prisoner, Leopoldo Lopez, vowed to continue his fight for freedom after being released from jail and placed under house arrest. Lopez's surprise prison release triggered speculation over the prospect of negotiations between the opposition and Venezuela's embattled leftist government of Nicolas Maduro, with a rising toll of death and destruction from three months of nonstop street protests. Lopez, leader of the Voluntad Popular (Popular Will) party and a symbol of resistance to the Maduro government, emerged hours after his release from prison looking fit and happy. *AFP*

'Quiet as ceasefire begins in south Syria'

BEIRUT - A cease fire in southern Syria brokered by the United States, Russia and Jordan began at noon local time on Sunday, with a monitor reporting quiet in three southern provinces. The cease fire was announced last Friday by Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov and covers Daraa, Quneitra and Sweida provinces. AFP

Aftershock causes damage in Philippine

MANILA - The strongest aftershock yet has snaken the central Philippines following last week's 6.5-magnitude earthquake that damaged a power plant and other buildings. No damage or casualties were immediately reported after the 5.4-magnitude earthquake yesterday morning. Renato Solidum, head of the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology, said the quake was strongly felt in and around Ormoc City and may trigger landslides or cause more damage to already damaged structures. He said it was the strongest aftershock of the 6.5-magnitude quake on July 7. The earlier earthquake left two dead and four people missing. It damaged a geothermal power plant, triggered landslides and collapsed a building with a grocery store and other shops. AP

ABADI DECLARES VICTORY FOR MOSUL

MOSUL - Iraqi Prime Minister Haider al-Abadi declared victory in the "liberated" city of Mosul this past Sunday, his office said, in the biggest defeat yet for the Islamic State group.

Abadi "arrives in the liberated city of Mosul and congratulates the heroic fighters and the Iraqi people on the achievement of the major victory," his office said in a statement. The announcement comes after a gruelling nearly nine-month battle to retake the northern

city from the jihadists after three years under their rule.

A photo on Abadi's official Twitter account showed him dressed in a black military uniform and cap as he arrived in Mosul to announce the recapture of the city.

The fighting did not seem to be completely over yet, with gunfire still audible in Mosul and air strikes hitting the city around the time the premier's office released the statement.





Swazi Jive to refund stall owners

SWAZI Jive caused an uproar on social networks earlier this month when they announced the price they would be charging for their stalls.

A lot of stall owners at the Hipnotik festival couldn't make profit due to unauthorised vendors who were selling food and certain merchandise for a far less price than what stall holders were charging inside the venue.

After a long discussion with the stall owners the Swazi Jive team decided that they would refund the stall owners. It is still not clear if they will all be getting their money back or this will be only for certain food stalls. The team is still trying to figure out if it will be a full refund or a certain percentage will be taken. Swazi Jive's PRO Noxolo Nkabinde confirmed that they would sit down as a team and discuss things further

"We are still yet to meet as a team and with our stall owners to discuss how they will be compensated," she

The way the stage was set up a lot of people were seated outside watching through the provided screens while others could see to the stage directly. This was a problem because most fun lovers saw no need to gain entry inside the venue since they could see the stage from afar.

While another problem was that a number of people were being turned back because they were either producing fake tickets or fake tags which the organisers rectified before it got out of hand.





Super Rugby quarterfinal positions are going down to the wire

JOHANNESBURG - The exact make-up of the 2017 Super Rugby quarterfinals may not be known until the completion of the very last match of the regular season.

Match 135 sees the Sharks host the Lions, who currently lead the South Africa Two Conference and who could finish as the top seed for the finals if they win and the Crusaders lose.

Indeed with all 18 teams in action in Round 17 the final positions of the eight quarterfinalists will be determined by the outcome of several games.

The four Conference winners will be ranked 1-4 based on their final number of tournament points and the wild card teams will be ranked 5-8 based on their final number of tournament points. So it is still all to play for with some intriguing matches to be played. The Crusaders (currently ranked first) are away to the Hurricanes (currently ranked fifth) with the reigning champions keen to maintain their ranking.

A Crusaders win will put them

RABADA BAN A 'BIG LOSS' FOR TEST CRICKET - ELGAR


LONDON - South Africa stand-in skipper Dean Elgar has said Kagiso Rabada's ban from the second match of the England series is a "big loss for Test cricket" and not just the Proteas.

The tourists suffered a thumping 211-run loss, with more than a day to spare, in the first Test at Lord's this past Sunday when they collapsed to 119 all out after being set 331 to win.

South Africa now have just a few days to recover before the second Test at Nottingham's Trent Bridge starts this Friday.

But their hopes of levelling the fourmatch series at 1-1 have been made considerably more difficult by the absence of fast bowler Rabada.

The 22-year-old received a onematch ban for his latest offence under the International Cricket Council's code of conduct as a result of swearing at Ben Stokes following his dismissal of the England all-rounder in



the first innings at Lord's.

"It's a big loss for everything, the Proteas and Test cricket," Elgar told reporters. Rabada has taken 77 wickets in 18 career Tests at an impressive average of under 25 apiece and

Elgar said, "he is a vitally important bowler. "He's been a phenomenal strength to our bowling attack for the last three years in all formats... I think for the game of cricket it is a loss."

Basic disciplines let us down - SA skipper Elgar

JOHANNESBURG - Proteas standin captain, Dean Elgar, says the squad will need to be a lot more ruthless with their basic disciplines in the 211-run loss to England in the first Test match at Lord's this past Sunday.

A dejected Elgar lamented the missed opportunities throughout the four days of cricket, which highlighted a below-par performance in the field.

He gave credit to the bowlers, who brought the team back into the match with a lethal performance with the ball on the fourth morning, taking the last nine wicket for 114 runs to set up a difficult but achievable target of 331 for victory.

"There were small things that impacted the Test in a big way," he admitted after the match. "Various dropped catches, our non-negotiable no-balls, issues that we had throughout the Test. That would have made life easier as a captain and life easier as a squad. We need to take it on the chin and crack on, we have to be a lot more ruthless with regards to our disciplines.

"I thought it was game on," he said of the feeling at lunch. "Massive credit has to go to our bowlers for implementing and keeping the game plan for as long as possible. We knew we had to get time out of this game with two days to go, it was going to be a tough feat for us. Going into lunch with them eight down I thought we had given ourselves an opportunity. That is why it is disappointing sitting here after things capitulated."

Elgar says he has learnt a lot during his short stint as captain, and says it will be important to look ahead given the short turnaround until the start of the second Test at Trent Bridge in Nottingham this Friday. "It has been a good week," he said of the captaincy. " It was quite enjoyable. It definitely could have been a lot easier, especially the start of the Test. It could have been a lot easier on myself if a few things went our way as a team. So be it, these are the punches you have to take, we have to get up tomorrow with a smile and not forget that in four days' time we start again.

"The reality of cricket is that you are always going to lose somewhere," he said. "The key thing is to bounce back as quickly as possible. I don't think there will be any drifting apart, we are still going to be a tight unit. We have to put a lot more emphasis on our next game."

Totti first came to Roma as a youth team player at the age of 13 and enjoyed a spectacular career with the club, scoring 307 goals in 786 appearances.


Farah insists he has nothing to hide after latest Fancy Bears hack

Winner

Koeman said in Rooney - who in his time at United won five Premier League titles and a Champions League - he was buying a player with a surefire winner's mentality.

"Wayne has shown me that ambition that we need and that winning mentality - he knows how to win titles and I'm really happy he's decided to come home," said Koeman.

"He loves Everton and he was desperate to come back. He is still only 31 and I don't have any doubts about his qualities. It's fantastic he's here."

Mourinho said he admired Rooney but understood both his desire for playing more football and to return to the club that nurtured his talent

"It is no secret that I have long been an admirer of Wayne," said Mourinho.

"He has been a model professional throughout his time at the club and will remain in the history books for many years to come.

"It is never easy to see a great player playing less football than he would like and I could not stand in his way when he asked to go back to Everton.





JOHANNESBURG - South African Football Association (SAFA) President Danny Jordaan says the association wants to talk to the PSL about the sale of club statuses.

"We are going to have a joint-liaison meeting soon with the PSL where these issues will be discussed," said Jordaan.

"Already you find a highly concentrated number of teams in one area and it is in our interest to have a national league covering the whole country.

"In the Premier League in England, you find that a team has the name of the location where it is based. Barcelona comes from Barcelona, Real Madrid is from Madrid and they can't move. "I see Cape Town City has gone that route and that is an indication of the 'rooted-ness' of the club in the area.

"And the second issue is of relocation, and as far as possible we must try and keep the team where it is. "The financial challenge is a reality that we are faced with and you will see that Arsenal in England is now playing in the Emirates Stadium and the owners are no longer English." citizen


According to KingFut, Wits have contacted the Egyptian giants to enquire about the possibility of signing the unsettled striker.









Coming to the event, the president urged the participants to take the course seriously, because the future of Swazi football depended on how they imparted the knowledge to the youngsters.


"I urge you guys to really take this course seriously because you have the knowledge the progress needed for Swazi football to improve. You are responsible for the future of the local game.

Also, I'm happy to see young people participating; imagine if I was to be taught anything at my age. I wouldn't grasp it, but you are all young and that means the future of our football is in safe hands.

Meanwhile, PLS Development Officer Banele Masondo said participating in the course would help him in the running of the development tournaments. "Personally, this course will help me learn on the steps we need to take in development football. Hence, this will all be considered when preparing for the tournaments."
