The Zambian President hosted his Majesty the King in 2015 on a similar visit.

MOZA MAN ARRESTED FOR CAR SMUGGLING

LUBOMBO Lukhozi Police Unit on Monday busted what is believed to be a car syndicate at Mhlumeni border where they arrested a 54-year-old Mozambican national and a Swazi woman.

Upon investigation the Swazi woman was released. The Mozambican man is reported to have been driving a suspected

stolen truck which carrying a Toyota D4D van also suspected to have been stolen.

Two police officers are reported to have been detained briefly and questioned

by Lukhozi but no arrests have made yet so far as investigations are still continuing.

Deputy Police Information and Communication Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the arrests of the Mozambican man and the recovery of a truck and a Toyota van last night.

She said investigations are still continuing on what is believed to have been a car smuggling syndicate to Maputo.

"This syndicate was smuggling stolen motor vehicles from Swaziland to Mozambique through the

Mhlumeni border post which is the only border operating 24 hours.

The syndicate is alleged to have been suspected for some time leading to a special operation being

established and conducted on Monday night," the source said.

SANU STUDENTS SHOCKER

SOUTHERN African Nazarene University (SANU) students who are sponsored by government received the shock of their lives when they received letters ordering them to fork out money as government is owing the institution tuition fees amounting to E4 772 per student.

Not only were students informed to pay the money owed by government, they were also informed that all owing students must pay first semester fees in full by the end of November failing which students will not receive their first semester results and won't be allowed to register for the second semester.

On tuition deposits all students were informed that they are required to pay a 30 per cent deposit of the first semester fees. Government sponsored students were promised to be refunded.

The students, according to the letter given to them, will be refunded their tuition deposit once the university has received full payment from the sponsor.

In another letter which is specifically directed to government sponsored students, they are informed that: "the University has been engaging with your sponsor so that the shortfalls in tuition

can be settled.'

However, the letter continues to state that regrettably, the engagement with government by the university has not yielded positive results. Therefore students were informed by the institution that the tuition shortfalls remained unpaid.

The university informed students that it will continue as an institution to pursue the sponsor to settle the balance and therefore encouraged students to settle the balance as paying of university fees remains their responsibility.

When contacted about the matter the Dean of Student Affairs Sonnyboy Mamba stated that indeed students were served with letters informing every student including government sponsored students to pay tuition fees including registration fees.

Mamba stated that however government sponsored students would be refunded their money once government makes payments.

the balance as paying of university fees Mamba stated that such fees were remains their responsibility.

Ministry of Labour acknowledges problem

THULANI Mkhaliphi the Principal Secretary of the Ministry of Labour and Social Security stated that they are aware of the issue of SANU students who have to pay the balance that is due.

Mkhaliphi said however this must not come out as something new to the students because they engaged with them about the issue.

The PS stated that as a ministry they are bound by the contract they signed

with the students.

He said just because the university has increased tuition fees does not mean that automatically the ministry will also automatically increase their sponsorship.

Loan

Mkhaliphi said this is a loan so they cannot increase fees without engaging all parties involved which may need to go back to the contract to amend it.

The principal secretary stated that changing the contracts is not just a one day issue.

Mkhaliphi added that however as a ministry they were open to students and willing to meet with them to forge a way forward on this matter.

He said students must follow the proper procedure when consulting them because they know that all parties concerned including the university must be present at the table.

Students say they have no money

MEANWHILE, students have revealed that they are not prepared to pay any cent to the university.

When contacted, SANU Students Representative Council Secretary Tiger Nxumalo confirmed that students received letters from the university reminding them about tuition fees.

Nxumalo stated that that

most students are from destitute families and have no financial muscle to pay for their tuition.

Promises

Nxumalo stated that even though the university has promised to refund government sponsored students must be noted that the institution has a tendency of not living up to its promises.

He stated that last year, they faced a similar scenario whereby first year students were forced to pay a starter pack fee of E8 585 with the promise that such money shall be refunded as soon as the ministry disburses their funds.

"However that has not been forthcoming, instead they were only refunded an amount of about E460," Nxumalo stated.

He said students are yet to meet and forge a way forward with regards to the issue.

Predicament

The SRC secretary blamed their sponsor for their predicament with the institution.

Nxumalo said the university had increased tuition fees about three times since 2014 but government has not changed its sponsorship as it has remained the same.

UNISWA students decry allowance increment for foreign based students

STUDENTS of the University of Swaziland have raised their concern in the manner in which government is giving preferential treatment for students based in South Africa and other countries.

In a statement UNISWA SRC President SibusisoSiyaya, stated that it had come to their attention that government sponsored students studying in South Africa and internationally, have their allowances increased.

"They refused to give us the exact amount of increment, but agreed that it has been increased with a justification that life abroad is more expensive so the students were suffering," Siyaya stated.

Money

He added that when he raised the case of UNISWA students, the response was that there is no money.

Siyaya said this means as students in the country, they need to live with the situation having students without scholarships, and living in inadequate meal allowances.

Responding to the concerns, Ministry of Labour Principal Secretary Thulani Mkhaliphi stated that students are given different sponsorships for different reasons.

He said many factors are taken into consideration when such is done.

He said for example they look at the cost of living at that country where the students is undergoing his studies.

PRIVATE COLLEGES OFFER BOGUS DIPLOMAS - SHEC

THE Swaziland Higher Education Council (SHEC), through its overhaul assessment of the higher education institutions, discovered that most of the colleges are offering bogus Primary Teaching Diplomas (PTD).

During an interview with this newspaper on the progress of the assessment on the country's higher learning institutions, SHEC Executive Director Mboni Dlamini said most of the higher learning institutions have been found to be offering mediocre PTD programmes.

He said the Council has noted, with concern, that higher education institutions are taking advan-

found to be offering teaching programmes and they deceive the students that they would be hired after completion yet those programmes are worthless.

"There is a lot of deception on the programmes that they are offering. Some of the programmes they offer are just the basic understanding of the teaching programme and not enough to equip someone to actually teach a syllabus in a school setting," he said.

Dlamini said the Council is working around the clock to finalise the assessment in all the institutions so they can finally release the list of all the institutions that are eligible to operate and those that are

He said the Council is cognisant of the fact that progress on the conducting of the assessments has now taken more time than they had initially envisaged.

"The public must understand that this kind of operation by the Council is the first of its kind.

"The Council needs to make sure that that the institutions are credible as well as the programs offered to the Swazi students.

"At the end, the wait will be worth it," he said.

Dlamini said the fortunate part for the students enrolled in these higher education institutions is that none of those that have been found with questionable programmes had awarded students with qualifications as yet.

He further said institutions that will have been found to be offer-

ing such programmes will be penalised at the end of the assess-

MAZDA VEHICLES BEING

MAZDA Motor Corp is recalling Mazda2, Mazda6 and Mazda RX-8 vehicles produced from 2003 with VIN numbers starting with MM6DE, JM6GG and JMZSE.

In a statement released yesterday, Mazda South Africa said the vehicles are being recalled due to possible faulty airbag inflators which may cause the airbag not to deploy correctly, which could lead to injury during accidents.

'We urge all owners of Mazda2, Mazda6 and Mazda RX-8 models that could possibly be affected to contact the Mazda dealership network, or Mazda South Africa customer care centre on 0860 069 700 or email customercare@mazda.co.za," reads the statement.

The statement that revealed owners of the mentioned models with the stated VIN stated above in Swaziland, Botswana and Namibia can call the

above number or visit the nearest Mazda dealership in their country for more information. Reuters reported yesterday that Mazda is recalling 19 000 units in South Africa due to airbag safety concerns as the Japanese car maker

extends a global recall to cover a wider manufacturing period.

The agency reported that the recall was prompted by investigations in Japan and North America for three different types of Takata Corp

manufactured airbags over safety concerns that inflators were defective.

"Takata airbag inflators have been linked to 17 deaths and more than 180 injuries worldwide, and the recalls will eventually cover about 125 million inflators," it said.

He, however, said they have not sold any Madza 2, Madza 6 and RX-8 models from 2003, 2004 and 2005 since

He further highlighted that those with import cars should not come to Carson for their inquiries but should contact their dealerships.

"Even though we service Mazda imports in our garage but we cannot help the public with imports because we only deal with local cars," he said.

PANIC AS ALARM TRIGGERED AT CORPORATE PLACE

THERE was a scare yesterday at The Corporate Place in Mbabane when a fire alarm was triggered at Standard Bank.

The incident which halted operations happened between noon and 12:30pm. Those in the bank including staff and customers were ordered out of the building as there were fears that there could be a fire in the building.

Standard Bank is at the second floor of The Corporate Place, with other banks like First National Bank and Nedbank. The Corporate Place is situated within the Swazi Plaza shopping Centre in Mbabane. The MTN office also situated at the Corporate Place was affected by the scare as people were in the office at that time were ordered out.

Triggered

One security officer told the newspaper that an alarm was triggered and people were ordered to has at the building anticipating a possible fire outbreak.


Another security of the said the alarm seemed to have been triged gered on one side of the building. It seemed as if the offices that were most affected by the scare were Standard Bank and MTN. However, the situation was quickly inormalised within 30 minutes.

Another woman found at the first floor of the building said she was also at Standard Bank when the incident occurred. She was with her two children.

She wondered how such could happen in a building like The Corporate Place. "This place is so beautiful and very much advanced. So, I do not understand how a fire could just break out because I am sure there were precautions taken to protect people against such incidents," she said.

Workers from Swaziland Fire and Emergency Services (SNFES) were seen inside Standard Bank attending to the problem. At that time, people were clustered at the entrance of the bank, wanting to get in and

continue with their activities as soon as the doors were open.

It is worth noting that some workers were seen doing some renovation works on the elevators of The Corporate Place during the fire scare.

Swazi Plaza Properties Facilities Manager Thanduxolo Nxumalo said there was a system installed at the Swazi Plaza.

The system, according to Nxumalo,

is known as the Ziton Fire System, which is addressable. This means the system can detect if there is a fire outbreak in any of the buildings or offices within the Swazi Plaza.

The system is installed in all the buildings within the plaza so that a fire outbreak can be directly attended inside the building.

The system, he said, did not show

them any fire outbreak at any of the buildings. In short, there was no fire at The Corporate Place.

SNFES Regional Division Officer Luke Lushaba said they did attend a scare at The Corporate Place yesterday. He said though an alarm was triggered, there was no fire. He said this could have been caused by the on-going renovations at the Corporate Place.

DAD TRIES TO KILL SONS WALKS FREE

FACING a charge of attempting to kill two of his children, a father yesterday left the accused dock a happy man after the Crown withdrew the charges against him.

Jeremiah Maseko was however seriously warned by High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi that he was lucky to get away with it and that he should not dare be found to have assaulted either his wife or children as he will be sent straight to prison for same.

The crown represented by Crown Counsel Sandile Mdluli moved an application that the charges against Maseko who attempted to kill his children by assaulting them with a knob stick, be withdrawn following a serious reconciliation between the children (complainants) and the mother.

Maseko according to the crown is also taking full responsibility of his family as confirmed by his wife Zodwa Nkenjane who gave evidence before court.

Maseko is alleged to have assaulted the children for visiting their grandfather's homestead which they did without his consent as their father and the incident happened at Hlane area where they are resident.

According to his wife, Maseko was not in his sober senses on the day in question and before Judge Nkosi issued the order, he warned Maseko against indulging in alcohol and further committing such serious offences.

a break from the cattle-rustlers in Lomahasha and had thought the issue of cattle-rustlers was buried. Little did had know that the thieves would bounce back and ravage their livestock investment.


Thieves

GOVT UPGRADES SGUJANA AFTER PUBLIC OUTCRY

THE ministry of information, communication and technology (ICT) has upgraded the problematic set top boxes (boSgujana) following public outcry.

The new upgrades come with a promise of a faultless transmission that will bring smiles to its users and attract new users in the near future as well. The upgrades were announced-by acting Principal Secretary Bhekithemba Gama together with the ministry's Director of Communications Andreas Dlamini yesterday during a press conference.

"You can now change from radio stations to television station or vice versa by pressing the TV/radio button on the Ntjintja remote control," Gama said.

He further added that the set top box users can use CH-(minus- or plus+) button to select radio channels.

"We apologise to the public for the technical glitches that they faced as

we were separating the TV and radio channels especially because we failed to update them on such, we have added the Voice of the Church (VOC) as the latest radio station, yet some parts of the country might not get it as yet, so we would advise that they

reboot their set top box," Gama said. He mentioned that rebooting the set top box will help in rescanning all available networks, where the radio station frequency will then be received.

"We are hoping to introduce more radio channels on the set top box, as

we first tested waters with VOC and since its success, we saw it fit that we could introduce more channels, if an opportunity like that avails," he promised.

Gama then urged the public to call their call centre whenever they faced technical glitches or needed assistance in the latest upgrades.

"Utilise our call centre; we have assisted a number of customers who were facing some glitches over the phone and on few cases, we had to drive to the customer to help, the staff is trained and if anyone has been mistreated, those cases should be reported and the right protocols will be followed," Bhekithemba explained.

Dlamini further explained that with all broadcast transmission media there will always be signal weaknesses during windy or rainy weather conditions.

Effect

"Some signals are lost by power cuts, since we all know that transmitters are not easily accessible, and when they are not attended they also run out of fuel resulting to loss of signal, while some other places found in valleys may experience same effect, we are working around the clock to ensure that our transmission reaches those places as well," Dlamini said.

He went on to add that the ministry is currently working on two cases from such places, Maphalaleni and Maseyisini.

"We have earmarked these places for signal strength and they will be covered before the end of the year, where we are expecting to sort other places as well," Dlamini revealed.

He added that they rely mostly on feedback from the public as with every complaint they attend to, they see where they can make improvements or maintain their good name.

SWAZI Mobile will open shop, come July 28.


The emerging mobile network will finally open shop at the end of the month, much to the anticipation of thousands of the Swazi people.

Another SA man found with dagga in father-in-law's car

A South African man who was visiting his wife in the country has been arrested after he was found driving his father-in-law's car not knowing that it had dagga concealed within

Justice Ngwenyama (38) of Ngodini in South Africa appeared before Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo and was charged with possession of dagga weighing 12.5 kg.

When making his submission before the principal mag-

istrate, Ngwenyama informed in court that he never intended to be found in possession of the illegal herb.

He stated that he was in the country visiting his girlfriend who lives at Nhlambeni.

He stated that he took his father-inlaw's car, a BMW with foreign registration plates, with the intention of using

it. Ngwenyama said while he was inspecting the car early in the morning before going police officers pounced on him, searched the car and found

The accused told the court that he was not even aware that there was dagga in the car.

Absented

He pleaded with the court to exercise leniency as he is a first time

offender. He informed the court that he had spent days in police custody and as a result absented himself at work. He told the court that if he is not seen for more days at work he risks losing his job. Khumalo, before pass-

ing sentence, told the accused that he did not accept the explanation that the dagga didn't belong to the accused.

He sentenced him to three years imprisonment with a fine option of E7 000.

He further told the accused that he was lucky because the application to have the car impounded by the state was withdrawn by the prosecutor.

SADC PARLIAMENTS WANT INVESTMENT IN YOU

PARLIAMENTS of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) want to ensure that the region's governments make sound investments on the youth.

This transpired at the SADC Parliamentary Forum (PF) Plenary Assembly Session, which was held at Mahe Island in Seychelles.

The theme for the Plenary Assembly Session was "Harnessing Demographic Dividend in SADC through Investment in youth."

The event is held twice a year, that is July and November, on rotational basis in all the member states.

This time, the event was held from July 3 to 15, 2017.

SADC Parliaments, during the session, noted that they had a central role to play if SADC member states were to effectively harness the demographic dividends through investment in youth.

They resolved to play their role in the following ways:

 Popularising the notion of demographic dividends in order to make sure that citizen's especially youth and women are informed about it so that they get involved.

Member states should ensure that there is accountability on the commitments signed up for through the AU vision 2063 and other related regional and International instruments.

 Where ratification is required Parliaments must act with speed in order to ensure effective domestication.

 And monitoring of implementation through its oversight role.

Noted was that the theme was in line with that of the African Union (AU), thus there was need for commemoration of youth in the development of our continent. There was need for dynamism, and an element of urgency to provide resources for them to be the new drivers of economic development.

The Plenary Assembly Session thereafter deliberated on a concept note for the Assembly theme, presented by United Nations Food Agricultural Programme (UNFPA) which unpacked that this concept was not new in the SADC region, but was assigned by the 2063



Diaspora. The Theme emanated from the decision of the 40th Plenary Assembly Session of November, 2016, following a recommendation by the Standing Committee on Gender Equality, Women's Advancement and Youth Development (GEWAYD).

The theme was viewed as timely as it came at the back of the 28th Ordinary Session of the Assembly of Heads of State and government of the African Union (AU) which was held in Addis Ababa Ethiopia in January 2017. At the AU 2017, the theme, whose title was: Harnessing the demographic dividend through Investments in the Youth" was launched.

The session started with activities of the Regional Women's Parliamentary Caucus (RWPC) from July 5 to 6, 2017, where they addressed issues of Women, the Girl Child and HIV AIDS, UN Commission on the status of women (CSW)'s resolution.

This session unpacked the Girl child challenges, which included amongst all the following:

early pregnancies,

human trafficking,

 disabilities especially on young women, and the need to curb on corruption practises, as these impact on the girl child activities, yet investing in girls is key, there is need to walk the talk especially on fiscal discipline.

The caucus was followed by deliberations of the executive committee and relevant subcommittees, which included amongst all the legal, human resources, and the finance subcommittees.

Also presented for deliberations were the reports from the following Standing Committees; I. Human and social development and spe-

cial programmes

II. Food, agriculture and natural resources, III. Democratisation, governance and human rights

IV. Trade industry, finance and investment V. And gender equality, women advancement and youth-development

Other reports included that of the Joint sitting of standing committees, and more.

Amongst the Speakers was also the Chief Executive Officer of the Youth Council from Seychelles, who advocated on the notion that education and health resources should be directed to the youth for rightful channels.

Members of the SADC PF also discussed and promised to work on making SADC PF a regional Parliament, just like in the Economic Community of West African States (ECOW-

We will work with private sector, says Martin

GOVERNMENT will work closely with the private sector to keep the National Referral Hospital operational.

This was revealed by Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini when addressing senators regarding the staffing and operations of the soon to be built National Referral Hospital on Monday.

Dlamini said government would not contract medical specialists to work in the hospital on a permanent basis but will use the specialists who are already in the Private Sector.

"We will engage the private sector, so we can map a way forward on how we can contract the doctors that are already there," he said.

He also stated that government would soon put out an advert for a Public Private Partnership, because government doesn't have the capacity to operate the hospital.

Dlamini said the PPP would be the one to operate the Referral.

'Again we will engage the private sector for the partnership," he said emphasising that the private sector would be largely involved in the The senators approved the loan Bill without

Harassed by a cop, seek audience with station commander

IN the event a member of the public feels threatened by a police officer, an audience with the station commander can be sought.

This was made known by Acting Chief Police Information and Communication Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati, following a post on social media where Political Activist Joy Ndwandwe was accusing a police officer, in the Crime Investigation Department (CID) of threatening her.

Threatened

Vilakati said the main objective of the police was to serve people and to keep them safe at all times, hence if one felt unsafe or threatened they should make that known to the police.

"Generally, if a person threatens you

and you really feel threatened by them, it is advisable to open a case with the police. In the event the person who makes the threat is a police, you have a right to go to the police where he is stationed or area where you were threatened. When you get to the station ask for the station commander and tell them what has happened," she said.

Existence

Vilakati stated that station commanders had a duty to protect the public, not only from criminals but members of the police who ill-treat the public in one way or the other.

Vilakati said people must not shy away from reporting police because the primary reason for the existence of the police was to protect the country's cit-

"I am unaware of the said case, but if a member of the public feels threatened by a police officer or is unsatisfied with their work, they can seek audience with the station commander," she said.

Reasons

Ndwandwe posted on her social media page, saying in the event she died mysteriously the first person to be questioned should be the CID police officer, who she named but cannot be published for ethical reasons.

Ndwandwe accused the officer of abusing her in full view of people over the past weekend. She alleged that not only did he abuse her verbally but he also threatened her life.

Incident

Ndwandwe in her post further alleged that she had seen the officer before the incident carrying his gun so she couldn't defend herself because she didn't know if he was carrying it.

Efforts to get hold of Ndwandwe hit a snag yesterday as her number was not available on the MTN network.


A woman lives to tell a tale after fighting off her a would be rapist and unfortunately broke her right ankle.

The 16-year-old Philile said she had to drop out of school, to take care of her younger siblings home, after her mother had to stay in hospital. "I was doing Form Four and since I was short of E800, which my mother was supposed to pay, I had to drop out of school and take care of my sister's three children," Philile said. She added that she would love to finish school, but she has to be home as the sole breadwinner is stuck in hospital, with a fractured ankle. Soon after the incident neighbours are said to have attempted to clear, the path that goes through the man-made bush only to anger the owner of the bush. "We have been struggling to get food ever since my mother left home for hospital, we live from hand-to-mouth situation, where our neighbours played a big role in ensuring that we are able to go to bed on full stomachs," Philile said.

FLORA Zwane said she was traumatised by the whole ordeal, yet her counselling sessions helped her to calm down and be thankful to be alive.

"I had to accept what had happened and count my lucky stars, thanking God for sparing my life, so to continue living for my children, since their father passed away in 2000 after an asthma attack,", she revealed. Zwane revealed she will take her stay in Madulini, one day at a time, as she is forced by circumstances to go back. "I have to be strong for my children, hide my fears as they need me the most, I can't be scared forever, I will curb it," she added.

Man fined E1 000 for impregnating 14-year-old girl

THE Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court heard how Charles Mngometulu (20) was arrested for impregnating a 14-yearold school girl.

The incident happened at the Mngometulu homestead at Vusweni in December.

The name of the minor has been deliberately withheld due to ethical reasons.

Appearing inside the Magistrate's Court on Monday, Mngometulu said he and the minor had a long history of sexual relations before the eventual pregnancy.

"The school going minor is my girlfriend and we have been having a sexual relationship for at least one whole year, before she got pregnant. It was not my intention to impregnate her at this tender age, unfortunately

the condom we were using got torn. At the time I did not think that it would be such a big problem as once or twice we had sex without a condom and nothing happened, I intend to marry her," he said.

Senior Magistrate Siphosini Dlamini expressed his displeasure at the fact that a minor was about to mother a child.

"It is really unfortunate to see such horrible things happening to the youth. In this case we have a child getting ready to mother another child, this is children raising children. In Swazi culture this is unacceptable, that is why according to Swazi custom a man would be fined six cattle if he made such a mess of impregnating a child like you have done. I also refuse to believe that your own parents knew about this relationship, otherwise they would have stopped it at the beginning. The Crown has not lead evidence against you, so I am forced to fine you only E1 000 or three years in a correctional facility for this statutory rape of this minor," he said.

SD ATTENDS SADC PUBLIC SECURITY EEMEE

SWAZILAND was part of the SADC Public Security Sub Committee (PSSC) meeting which was convened in Dar es Salaam, United Republic of Tanzania. last week.

The PSSC is an annual statutory meeting convened to reflect on progress achieved in the implementation of public security programmes for 2016/2017 financial year.

Swaziland, Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, United Republic of Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe were amongst the countries that were in attendance.

The PSSC was officially opened by Ambassador Simba Yahya, Acting Permanent Secretary from the Ministry of Home Affairs, United Republic of Tanzania.

Crime

The SADC Secretariat was led by Jorge Cardoso, Director of the Organ on Politics, Defence and Security Affairs, who reminded the member states present that, public security remains more relevant today and critical, and forms part of governments multi-sectoral approach to address transnational organcontributing towards sustainable regional growth.

The PSSC considered strategic matters to be recommended to the Ministerial Committee of the Organ on Politics, Defence and Security Cooperation for consideration.

In this regards, the PSSC considered the status of signature and ratification of the SADC Protocol on Facilitation of Movement of Persons.

Strategy

The PSSC observed that the SADC protocol on facilitation of movement of persons remained relevant and critical for the region, particularly for regional integration and development. Member states that have not signed and or ratified the protocol were urged to expedite the signing and ratification process.

The PSSC also discussed bilateral visa exemption agreements within the region, and noted that Swaziland amongst the 11 SADC member states namely Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Seychelles, Swaziland, South Africa, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe have all exempted each other from visa requirements. The PSSC also noted progress achieved by Angola towards finalising Bilateral Visa Exemption Agreements with most of the SADC member states.

PSSC also discussed free movement of persons in Africa, as envisaged in the African Union (AU) Agenda 2063, which calls for free movement of persons and the establishment of continental institutions leading to full economic integration by 2030. As part of the continental agenda, the PSSC considered a Desk Research on Implementation of the AU Migration Policy Framework within the region.

The desk research conducted by Advocate Maemo Machethe highlighted that SADC has made significant progress in the implementation of the AU migration policy framework. However, the research also recommends among others, the need to develop a SADC Comprehensive Migration Policy and a Regional Internally Displaced Person Policy. The PSSC further discussed piloting of the UNIVISA and acknowledged that the SADC UNIVISA is strategically important and therefore its implementation modalities should be finalised. In conclusion, the PSSC discussed the SADC common position on implementation of free movement of persons in Africa, harmonisation of operating hours at Ports of Entries and the need to introduce Coordinated Border Management.

The PSSC further urged member states to implement the Regional Enforcement and Anti-Poaching (LEAP)Strategy and align their National Policies with LEAP the Strategy.

LIGWALAGWALA REACHING EXTINCTION?

The law was not strict enough to the illegal hunters who were feeding an increasing demand for the bird's feathers and meat

PEAK Timbers Community Liaison Officer Nhlanhla Nxumalo has raised serious concerns about the possible extinction of Swaziland's national bird affectionately known as the Ligwalagwala in the Northern Hhohho.

Nxumalo said the bird was being illegally hunted at a very fast rate especially in Hhelehhele and Buhleni.

The law was not strict enough to the illegal hunters who were feeding an increasing demand for the bird's feathers and meat.

"Unfortunately, we are having a very serious issue with the illegal hunting of the national bird. The best way to stop illegal hunting of any wild animal is to close and control the market for the animals' products, unfortunately this is not happening. In the case of the Ligwalagwala there is a big market for its feathers and meat, this is then fuelling the illegal hunting market.

The law seems to be relaxed when it comes to arresting people found with the bird's features, it is not like other wild animals where people are arrested if they are found with a hide or any other parts of the animal. We are fighting an uphill battle with this bird and in return we are seeing population numbers ever decreasing in Northem Hhohho," he said.

Last year, the Swazi Observer reported that the population of the national bird was dwindling.

He said they were hoping that

the public would see the problem and help conserve the animal, but this has not happened.


Another thing that they find strange was where all the fire arms that are used to hunt the bird are coming from.

"It is no secret that the bird can only be hunted with a rifle or another long barrel firearm, makeshift sling shots do not always work on the hunting of this bird because when wounded the bird will still fly to a distant place to die. Thus, the hunter will get nothing for all his hard work, so due to this hunters have started using guns because they can shoot the bird in the head killing it immediately.

This aids the hunters who then sell the bird's feathers after first drying them. We have also heard that the birds meat is also eaten," he added.

Acting Police Public Relations Officer (PRO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said they have to first research on the number of arrests made particularly towards the poaching of the national bird before they can make a proper

"We have to first check how many people have been arrested for the poaching of the national bird before we can comment on the issue. Currently we have had only a few arrests being made in the area of poaching, but after we have collected all the data I am pretty sure we will have a better picture of the number of arrests that have been made," she said.



LEON Malambe (25) from Hhelehhele was arrested by the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) after he went on a violent rampage with a pickaxe assaulting his own mother and sister.

The incident happened in the eve of July 7 at the Malambe homestead in Hhelehhele.

Malambe was subsequently charged with three counts of assault and one charge of malicious damage to property.

"The police were responding to a call by Simphiwe Malambe who is the mother of Leon Malambe, the police were told over the phone that he was outside the homestead armed with a pickaxe. He had already broken two windows and was chopping down the locked front door in an effort to gain access to the room where his mother was hiding," a source said.

The police then rushed to the scene; they first had to restrain Malambe who was still holding the pickaxe. After this struggle for the weapon the police were then told by the victims that Malambe had infact already assaulted his mother with the pickaxe before running into the house to lock herself inside for safety.

"After arriving to the homestead the police found out that Malambe had already assaulted his mother once on the left rib with the pickaxe and once on the right shoulder.

Pickaxe

"While all this was happening, two other people were also assaulted with the pickaxe, these two have been identified as Lungelo Shongwe who got struck once in the stomach and Zimama Malambe who got hit once on the back with the pickaxe," said the source.

Acting Police Public Relations Officer (PRO) Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed the incident.

Licences

"We as the Pigg's Peak Town Council have to come out and again tell the kingdom through the media that the council is not the one that awards the many liquor licences in the town.

"This is done by the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade, they are the ones who are responsible for allowing so many alcohol outlets in Pigg's Peak to be opened.

"Unfortunately, the general public do often assume that it is the town council who award these licences, and this is a very false assumption and reflects badly on our organisation that is determined to improve Pigg's Peak," she said


Disappearance

Myeni said there were people or individuals who feared for his life who always tell him not to continue with the investigations as even others such as law enforcers were seemingly developing weak knees in pursuing the matter.

"People tell me that I am placing my life in danger if I keep investigating the matter. Others I meet along the streets tell me to forget about it as it is a complex matter because even experts in the field of investigations are failing to come up with something tangible," said Myeni.

Myeni said while he was happy that there were people who were concerned about his safety, however, he would not 'abandon' what he had already started.

"It is cowardice to stop pursuing this issue when advised by people to be careful. Being a PI comes with such challenges.

There are times where you have to be brave and it is exactly what I have decided to do. My work is not a bed of roses and that is why I am going to the foreign land on

MAN BURNS DOWN LOVER'S HOUSE

When given a chance to mitigate, Masuku sincerely apologised for his actions as he said he was angry. "What I did was a mistake your

worship, I am sorry.

My mother is sick, I wish to go and look after her," he said. He pleaded guilty to the charges and never challenged the evidence brought to court by the Crown. He was fined E6 000 or four years imprisonment on the first count.

For the second count, the court fined him E5 000 or three years imprisonment, and a further E600 or five months imprisonment for theft. However, the court made count one and two to run concurrently, which means Masuku is expected to pay E6 600 to regain his freedom.

The court ruled his sentence would be backdated to May 18 when he first appeared in court.

Hlatikulu low registration turn-up explained

HLATIKULU town recorded the lowest number of voters during the registration of the local government

The registration closed at the end of last month and at Hlatikulu, only 429 residents registered.

The town has a population of over 2 070 people residing within the town's boundaries.

This means the 429 people who registered are to make a decision for the over 2 000 residents. Depending on the outcome of the voter roll exercise as it is possible that from the 429 people who registered, others do not qualify to vote for other reasons, the figure is likely to come down.

Contributed

Chief Executive Officer Bongani Dlamini said he was also disappointed by the low number of people who registered. He said he was not quite sure as to what contributed to the poor turnout. However, he hinted that other reasons could be that some of the residents only decided to come forward on the last day of the registration

"I may not be sure whether it was lack of interest or the people thought

there would be an extension or what. What I noticed is that on the last day (June 30), that was when many rushed to register and that led to many being left out. There was congestion even in the system we were using. It's typical of Swazis to jump on a bus when it is already departing," said Dlamini.

Residents

Others interviewed however said the poor turnout was due to the existing friction as some of the residents do not want certain individuals being voted into office. Hlatikulu is divided and the previous council team was already becoming unpopular with some of the residents who even suggested that some of the councillors and part of the administration should be investigated. So serious was the matter that a petition was delivered to

the Minister of Housing and Urban Development Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza who was requested to intervene.

Badmouthing and backstabbing each other within the team of councilors was rife with some of them labeled as

Dlamini did not want to commit himself on whether the division in the town contributed to the a low number of people registered.

"I can't comment on that. What I can only say is that I was not happy with the numbers. I was looking at having over 500 or so people registering. More than anything, I think people delayed registering and only realised that time was up on the last day. Others probably thought there was to be an extension, something which never happened," said Dlamini.

Gutteres said this during his meeting with the country's Ambassador and Permanent Representative to the United Nations in New York, Melusi Masuku. He was presenting letters of credence to the organisation and they were accepted by Gutteres.

Masuku, who is the new ambassador of the country to the UN after the reshuffle that took place in October last year, presented his credentials to Gutteres beginning of July.

Meeting

During their meeting Gutteres, when accepting the letters of credence, pledged his organisation's continued support to the country and all its endeavours.

The secretary general also highlighted his satisfaction with achievements made by the country in as far as democracy and human rights were concerned.

Masuku in turn thanked the secretary 'general' for welcoming and receiving the credentials and further conveyed felicitations on behalf of His Majesty King Mswati III, the Indlovukazi and the entire Swazi nation following his appointment and assumption of office in January and for the entire duration of his tenure of office. Masuku further expressed his delight on the recognition of the efforts the country was making in pursuit of the UN's values on democracy and human rights.

Furthermore, he informed the secretary general that in October 2018, the country will hold general elections and that the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) had started educating the public on the process of elections, voting and their rights as far as elections and voting are concerned.

When contacted, Masuku confirmed that he

"I informed the Secretary General that as part of my mandate here, I will be paying interest to issues of development in particular those that can assist in uplifting the standard of living of our people in pursuit of His Majesty's Vision to see the country attain a First World status by 2022 hence we looking forward to the upcoming High Level Political Forum on the implementation of sustainable development goals to take place on 10 to 20 July 2017 in New York," he said.

Masuku is amongst the first Swazi Ambassadors to present credentials after the October reshuffles.

Others who have presented letters of credence include Nonjabuliso Gwebu Ambassador to the United States of America, Dumsile Sukati High Commissioner to the Republic of South Africa and Christian Nkambule High Commissioner to the United Kingdom.

Globally, forty (40) per cent of young people are unemployed or ranked amongst "the working poor," this situation prompted the inclusion of youth skills in the prospective 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The agenda recognises the importance of tackling youth concerns, in particular unemployment and calls specifically for promoting youth employment and economic empowerment.

Each and every day, numerous numbers of our young people are placed in positions whereby they must risk their lives in the hope of finding

economic opportunities in distant places. This is why education and training are key determinants of success in the labour market, but unfortunately, existing systems are failing to address the learning needs of many young people.

Skills affect people's economic development in many ways but they are not only limited to economic impacts and playing a positive role in career prospects

Adults with low levels of foundational skills have a higher likelihood of reporting poor health and they also display levels of social anxiety as evidenced by less participation in community groups or meetings.

Skills are also key in tackling inequality, therefore investing in human capital is the single most effective way of not just promoting growth but also its fair distribution.

The simplest method of understanding the importance of investing in youth skills development is that investing in skills is far less costly, in the long run for our country, than paying the price of poorer health, lower incomes, unemployment and social exclusion – all of which are closely tied to lower skills.



PUBLIC PRIVATE PARTNERSHIPS WILL DRIVE THE SUCCESS OF NHI

SOUTH AFRICA - Since the first Board of Healthcare Funders (BHF) conference in 1999, the BHF annual conference has attracted a lineup of local and international speakers who have continued to provide local, regional and international perspectives on various issues relating to the healthcare industry.

This year's theme, "embracing universal health coverage", has ignited engaging discussions on the private sector's role in national health Insurance.

The conference brought together industry leaders, government and the private healthcare sector to identify ways in which to ensure the success of what is said to be South Africa's biggest healthcare reform system.

Speaking at the opening of the 18th annual BHF conference, Dr. Clarence Mini, acting Managing Director, BHF Southern Africa, pleaded with the department of health to consider partnerships with the private sector in implementing national health insurance, and to utilise the current available resources in private healthcare to support and help drive NHI.

Implentation

He said, "as we look ahead at the pending implementation of NHI, as with any change, the journey towards universal healthcare will present new challenges.

However, the promise of partnership, political will and good leadership might make the journey ahead a lot easier than we have all imagined." In his welcome address Ian Douglas Neilson, the Executive Deputy Mayor of the city of Cape Town, echoed those sentiments with regard to the need for partnerships in implementing NHI, saying, "last month's approval of the national health insurance white paper by cabinet represents a substantial policy shift that will necessitate a massive reorganisation of our healthcare, both private and public, and this will present a challenge to both the public and private healthcare sectors in South Africa."

He said, "over the years, we have learnt that we will not succeed in achieving anything on our own, and we have to work in partnership with our communities, NPOs, and the private sector, as we have seen the threat of Republicans wanting to repeal ObamaCare, and how it is argued that, this will be a 'death sentence'

change, the journey towards universal healthcare will present new challenges" for the US healthcare system.

"Only sustained, successful partnerships will enable South Africa to overcome the many challenges of our rapidly urbanising environment, and will in turn ensure that we become more resilient," said Neilson.

"One of the findings from the pilot phase shows the high prevalence of stunting, with 27 per cent of children under five considered stunted and 10 per cent severely stunted.

"This is presenting a challenge to the department of education, as we are giving teachers children with hearing and sight problems, and waiting for them to be adults. This is a big problem, and South Africa cannot afford to sit back and not respond to the healthcare needs of vulnerable groups," said Matsoso.

The department of health is looking to set up a National Health Commission.

She said, "NHI will not be affordable unless we deal with health promotion and prevention, and the role of the commission will be to assist in dealing with the risk factors that drive our non-communicable diseases, and put in place the necessary structures for setting up the NHI.

"For this reason, we must prioritise and respond to the healthcare needs of South Africa's children, and the National Health Insurance will go a long way towards the first steps to providing healthcare access.

"As we look ahead at the pending implementation of NHI, as with any

needs that have not been met, we cannot talk about economic transformation when we cannot meet the basic healthcare needs of people," noted Matsoso

She explained: The plan is to create an interim structure for the NHI, where we have a CEO who runs the system with a team of people. Our aim is to upskill, reskill and invest in our people to get them ready for NHI. This will require conscious efforts from academic institutions as well, as they would have to deliver on this capacity.

Within the legislative framework, a number of laws need to be amended, in particular the South African National Health Act and the Medical Schemes Act. Currently a draft bill has been published for commentary, and the department of health is inviting all in the healthcare sector, civil society, the public, and interested parties to submit commentary by 31 July 2017.

We also need to identify areas where we can consolidate various schemes, and this is going to be a process that involves schemes. Our aim is to create a structure that involves the department of health, the medical scheme industry, and the Council for Medical Schemes (CMS) in order to ensure that this reform is a success.

In closing, Dr. Mini explained that, "When discussions on NHI matured in 2008, BHF members took a decision to consciously support government in implementing NHI.

At that time, many people were not happy about the idea, and we supported NHI at a time when it was not favourable to support it, being fully aware that if the public and private sectors collaborate, we can make a success out of the NHI system and can begin to draw learnings for the rest of the Southern Africa region."

Resourcing

He reiterated that the department must look to the private sector for resourcing and utilise the already available resources in the private sector for the CEO positions that would be created for NHI. He cautioned that existing expertise within the private sector should be leveraged, and that NHI should not be politicised, but should be a collaborative effort that seeks to achieve the vision set by the United Nations to ensure that all people have access to healthcare, as a necessary human right.

BHF members include medical schemes, administrators and managed care organisations throughout the Southern African region, with membership in eight countries, namely, South Africa, Malawi, Lesotho, Zimbabwe, Namibia, Botswana, Mozambique and Swaziland.

Over 17 countries from around the world are represented at the 18th Annual BHF Conference on universal health coverage currently underway from 16 - 19 July 2017 at the International Convention Centre (ICC) in Cape Town.

Positive publicity and effective gov-

The country's National Development Plan aims to eliminate poverty and reduce inequality by 2030. South Africa can realise these goals by drawing on the energies of its people. The country also needs to grow an inclusive economy, build capabilities, enhance the capacity of the state, and promote leadership and partnerships throughout society.

The plan makes it clear that to accelerate development, all South Africans must come on board. Leadership in all sectors must also put the country's

collective interests ahead of narrow, short-term goals.

This will require policy changes, the implementation of government programmes and holding people especially political leaders - accountable for their actions. Also sorely needed are innovative solutions to complex challenges like poverty, unemploymentan inequality.

South Africa urgently needs to recover from the damage caused by "Zumafication" - where its president is accused of running the country through personal networks of favouritism and cronyism. John Wallis, the founder of The People Capital Project SA says some members of President Jacob Zuma's executive have become tainted as corrupt and untrustworthy kleptocrats.

Many promises, scenario plans and forecasts have not been translated into homegrown and concrete development proposals, backed by a robust development curriculum, to help South Africa turn the socio-economic corner. The country has yet to be characterised by high levels of innovation, equality, opportunities, economic justice and human rights. As such, the hopes and expectations of the poor have collapsed, leaving them even poorer (and less productive) than they previously were. Zuma has become a prisoner of his own making - both the tool and agent of a self-serving political elite, amid growing poverty and hunger. How long can this go on before the country's economy already in the doldrums - implodes, and a deep rooted entitlement inspired complacency turns into social upheaval?

Honouring Mandela's legacy

This state of affairs often leads to secrecy, deep political factions, state capture, looting and corruption, as already seen. The growing dispossession of citizens amid growing accumulation by a few elites results in growing economic injustice, leaving more people on the fringes of society. Where the state and corporate bosses are only driven by financial growth and gain, without coupling it with productive development projects, they hold the down-trodden to ransom. South Africans can no longer standby and watch their "house" burn. To truly honour Mandela's legacy, they should espouse the values of active citizenship and help restore the world's confidence in their country. Otherwise, they'll continue barking at the moon.

CHAMPIONS ENACTUS VOCTIM NEEDS E40 000

AFTER winning the ENACTUS Swaziland National Championship title for the third time in a row on July 1, Gwamile VOCTIM will now represent the country at the ENACTUS World Cup in London, UK on September 26 – 28.

Now the only hiccup is that the team needs to purchase a biogas digester for their project worth between E10 000 to E40 000 according to ENACTUS Country Director Teclar Maphosa-Dube.

ENACTUS Gwamile VOCTIM beat 12 other teams with their social enterprise project during the national competitions.

"The team is currently seeking funding for the procurement of the biogas digester in order to implement the next phase of the project. The costs can range from E10 000 to E40 000. Investors or partners that would like to support the team and community initiative can contact the ENACTUS office," Maphosa said.

Adding, she said phase two of project by the team would see it installing the biogas digester for production of renewable energy. The team is also looking into producing manure from the used diaper residue.

As well they plan to replicate the enviro health diaper disposal project in other communities around the country. There are 290 people that have been directly impacted by this project.

"ENACTUS Gwamile VOCTIM with their motto 'A crisis is an opportunity, where others see a crisis, we see a chance for employment' started their enviro health diaper disposal project in Ludzeludze.

The team saw an opportunity to help create businesses for five unem-

ployed community members who are the project beneficiaries and live in a filthy environment that had diapers littered all over the place.

The EHDD project is a business solution which enables the community to dispose diapers and other waste in a proper manner to promote environmental cleanliness as well as to generate income.

Maphosa said ENACTUS Gwamile VOCTIM partnered with Technoserve to help train the beneficiaries on entrepreneurial skills, business profitability, and sustainability.

"The team further partnered with Nedbank to train the community members on record keeping for the project and financial management. As a result, three diaper stations using recycled plastic bottles, reaching out to 84 homesteads have already been established around the Ludzeludze community. A total of 3 600 two litre plastic bottles have been repurposed to make the diaper stations," said the country director.

The project created a solution by clearing the community of Ludzeludze of hazardous waste such as diapers, cans, bottles, plastics and papers, by introducing a green house where all this waste would be disposed of at a fee.

The beneficiaries also sell and install catalier pavers to customers as well as to provide advertising space to clients at a charge of E400 per month. A monthly income of E1 398 has been made from this project since February this year.

The profit has boosted one of the lead beneficiaries, Mr. Xaba by a whopping 466 per cent increase from a monthly income of E300 from piece jobs that he used to do. At least 25 per cent of the profits are re-invested into the project. This is phase one of the project.



FRAUD COSTS PRIVATE HEALTHCARE R22BN - SIU

CAPE TOWN - At least 7% of all medical claims in South Africa are fraudulent, costing their members annually between R2 500 and R2 800 to cover fraudulent expenditure, said Andy Mothibi, CEO of the Special Investigating Unit (SIU).

Addressing delegates on the second day of the Board of Healthcare Funder's (BHF) annual conference in Cape Town, Mothibi shed some light on the incidence of fraud in the private and public healthcare sector in South Africa.

The total fraud costs in the South African private healthcare systern, iviotnibi said, is estimated at approximately R22bn each year.

Estimates by the Healthcare Forensic Management Unit (HFMU) of the BHF find that at least 7% of all medical aid claims in South Africa are fraudulent and the figure could be as high as 15%.

Fraud in public healthcare sector is also rife, he said, citing the following statistics:

R24bn of provincial health departments' expenditure between 2009 and 2013 was irregular.

A third of the Northern Cape's provincial healthcare spending -

R1bn - was irregular.

In Gauteng, irregular expenditure amounted to R5.3 billion between 2009 and 2012.

Although there was an improvement in irregular expenditure as a proportion of the total health expenditure from 11% in 2010-11 to 4.8% in 2011-12, the figure increased again to 6.1% in 2012/2013.

In a separate presentation on fraud in the healthcare industry, Gregory Pratt, senior clinical advisor at Medscheme's forensic unit cautioned that South Africa's proposed National Health Insurance scheme stand to be plundered with billions of rand unless there is substantial investment in protective anti-fraud technology.

"Our healthcare system is targeted by syndicates and devious practitioners, as it easier than committing other financial crimes," Pratt said.

"This should serve as a grave warning for the NHI initiatives. Unless there is substantial investment in protective technology we stand to lose billions of rand due to the plundering of NHI funds." fin24

MAZDA RECALLS 19 000 CARS IN SOUTH AFRICA

JOHANNESBURG - Mazda is recalling 19 000 cars in South Africa due to air bag safety concerns as the Japanese car maker extends a global recall to cover a wider manufacturing period, its local unit said yesterday.

The recall was prompted by investigations in Japan and North America for three different types of Takata manufactured air bags over safety concerns that inflators were defective.

The US National Highway Traffic Safety Administration said in July that new testing was prompting Takata to declare 2.7 million air bag inflators defective in Ford, Nissan and Mazda



Takata air bag inflators have been linked to 17 deaths and more than 180 injuries worldwide, and the recalls will

Vodacom CEO calls R34.6bn Safaricom deal transformative

MIDRAND - Vodacom shareholders voted in favour of acquiring a 34.94 per cent indirect stake in Kenya's Safaricom.

The shareholders voted at an annual general meeting held before the release of the group's financial results for the year ended March 31 2017. The majority of shareholders (99.59 per cent) were in favour of the resolution, while only 0.40 per cent were against.

The deal will see Vodacom acquire 87.5per cent of issued share capital of Vodafone Kenya. The cost of Vodacom Group's acquisition equates to R34.6bn. The newly acquired stake will position Vodacom Group strategically in the east African market and give it exposure to Kenya's high growth market. Safaricom is a market leader in Kenya with a market share of 71per cent. "Safaricom is a high growth, high margin, and high cash generating business," the group stated in a circular to shareholders.

Vodacom CEO Shameel Joosub said the deal is transformative. "It gives us access to a high growth, high margin business.'

He added that Safaricom is one of the quality asset players in the market, and that the deal would allow Vodacom to work in the financial services space. Outgoing Chairperson Peter Moyo described the deal as important.

Mobile penetration in Kenya is only at 88 per cent, indicating room for market expansion, the group stated. For the year ended March 31 2017, Safaricom reported revenue growth of 14.2 per cent and an Ebitda margin of 48.1per cent.

The transaction will also allow Vodacom to diversify its financial profile. Its interest in Safaricom will contribute 15per cent to the group's earnings. fin24

MTN half-year earnings improve by 20%

has announced that it expects to report an improvement of at least 20 percent in both headline earnings per share and earnings per share for the six-month period ended 30 June.

This would be a significant improvement in MTN's interim results compared with a headline loss per share of 271 cents and attributable loss per share of 301 cents reported in the prior comparable period that ended 30 June 2016.

MTN said the negative performance in the prior year period was mainly as a result of nonrecurring costs, including the Nigeria regulatory fine of 474 cents per share.

Professional fees related to the fine of 73 cents per share and losses of 136 cents per share from MTN's 51 percent equity interest

JOHANNESBURG-MTN Group in Nigeria Tower InterCo B.V., mainly as a result of unrealised losses on US dollar-denominated loans, also contributed to negative performance in 2016.

> MTN was initially fined US \$5.2 billion by the the Nigerian Communications Commission for not deactivating more than five million unregistered SIM cards, but the fine was later reduced to \$1.67 billion after negotiating the fine with the Nigerian government.

The South African based telecommunications giant has since paid \$254 million of the fine after agreeing to settle the debt over three years. MTN said it was in the process of finalising its interim financial results which will be announced on the Stock Exchange News Service of the JSE on 3 August.

World's largest independent oil trader ditches Gupta dea

JOHANNESBURG - Vitol Group, the world's largest independent oil trader, walked away from a deal to buy a stake in the Richards Bay Coal Terminal from a company controlled by the Gupta family.

"The consortium comprising Vitol and Burgh Group Holdings will not be proceeding with the acquisition," the commodities-trading house said in a statement on Monday.

The proposed deal, first reported by Bloomberg News

in September 2016, would have seen Vitol and South Africa's Burgh Group acquire Optimum Coal Terminal from the Gupta's Tegeta Exploration and Resources. It would have given the consortium a 7.61 per cent stake in Richards Bay and rights to ship about 8 million tonnes of the fuel from South Africa annually.

The Guptas are friends with President Jacob Zuma. In December 2015 the family, along with Zuma's son Duduzane, bought Optimum through Tegeta for R2.15bn (\$163m) from miner and trading house Glencore.

The purchase would have given Vitol, which handles more than 7 million barrels of oil a day and more than 30 million tonnes of coal annually, access to a key export facility in one of the largest coal-producing countries.

Vitol has trading and marketing operations in South Africa and its VTTI unit is building a fuel-storage facility in Cape Town. In 2012, it formed a coal-trading company in neighboring Mozambique by buying a stake in a terminal that exports coal from South African mines.

While South Africa has quality coal reserves and is well positioned to export the fuel to India and China, shipments are constrained by limited port capacity. Only shareholders have an automatic right to export through Richards Bay, which accounts for almost all of the country's coal-shipping capacity. fin24

Mystery of Eskom's money

JOHANNESBURG - The clock is ticking for scandal-infested Eskom as it readies to release its financial results amid confusion around the state firm's true financial solvency.

Eskom's financial results briefing is now scheduled for today after it was suddenly postponed two weeks ago.

The question is if it will shed any light on whether Eskom is in good financial standing or not, amid a host of controversies that has plagued the institution. The doublespeak of Public Enterprises Minister Lynne Brown and Finance Minister Malusi Gigaba has done little to lift the fog.

Gigaba last week hinted that Eskom was on the verge of a bailout, while Brown recently insisted that Eskom was doing well.

Earlier this year Brown even said that Eskom was coping with its 2.2 per cent tariff increase, which was

much less than it had asked the national regulator for.

According to a leaked application, Eskom will ask for a 20 per cent tariff hike next time around on the grounds that it won't be able to operate sustainably without collecting on that revenue. Yet last month, after Eskom's annual general meeting, Brown reiterated that Eskom "recorded positive results according to its financial results

presented to the AGM".

She said Eskom was in a better financial position than it was a year and two years ago, at this time.

But over the weekend, Eskom refuted claims that it only has R20bn left in the kitty.

The Sunday Times, citing leaked financial statements, reported that the utility's current funds are only likely to last for the next three months and that Eskom may not be able to pay its 49 000 employees' salaries come November, unless it receives a bailout.

The Sunday Times report also suggested the postponement of Eskom's results is to avert a crisis

> that would have required it to pay back R15bn owed Development Bank Southern Africa (DBSA). The DBSA

granted that loan Eskom in 2010, and Eskom has drained the facility. But one of the conditions in the loan is

that it would be recalled if Eskom failed to achieve a clean audit, a disaster for the apparently cashstrapped state utility.

But Eskom on Sunday denied that it is facing a cash crisis.

"External auditors have confirmed Eskom is a going concern, and as a result the company sees these reports as being inaccurate and misleading," it said in a statement.

Puma raises forecast after second-quarter sales

FRANKFURT - German sporting goods firm Puma raised its sales and profits forecasts for the full year Monday, saying it enjoyed strong second-quarter performance and was confident for the second half.

The Bavaria-based firm now expects to increase sales between 12 and 14 percent, adjusting for currency effects - up from "a low double-digit percentage" increase previously.

That would mean growth up to twice as fast as last year's, when high-profile sponsorships of sports teams like France's footballers, star athletes including sprinter Usain Bolt and celebrity endorsements from Rihanna and other musicians powered Puma ahead.

Global sporting events such as the Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro and the UEFA Euro 2016 tournament helped showcase the leaping-cat logo to millions worldwide. But the lack of such rare high points hasn't held back growth this year for the Nike and Adidas rival, with currency-adjusted sales reach-

ing 968.7 million euros between April and June - a 16.3-per cent increase on the same period in 2016.

The group also saw a massive boost to its operating, or underlying, profit in the second quarter, bringing in 43.4 million euros compared with 11.9 million last year.

That prompted Puma to lift its operating profit prediction to between 205 and 215 million euros (\$235-256 million) for 2017, up from past guidance of between 185 and 200 million euros.

It offered less detail on its bottom line, saying only that it expected net profits to improve "significantly" compared with last year's level of 62.4 million euros.

That figure was a 68-per cent improvement on 2015 profits.

Monday's announcement was the second time Puma lifted its forecasts for this year, as it reported a sunnier outlook in April following a strong first quarter.

The company will release full second-quarter results on July 26.

RAND TOUCHES 2 WEEK HIGHS, JSE GAINS

JOHANNESBURG - The Rand reached its firmest level in two weeks yesterday as the suspension of new mining laws and weak data from the US pushed the currency past crucial technical levels and lured back investors hungry for high yields.

At 5 pm, the rand was bid at R12.9238 to the dollar, 10.77c stronger than at the same time last Friday, softer than the session-best R12.89.

"The disappointing US inflation

numbers and the mothballing of the mining charter, that momentum is still coming through today," said currency dealer at Treasury, One Andre Botha,

Last Friday, South Africa said it had suspended the implementation of new mining laws, which included raising the level of shares black people should own in mining firms, pending a court ruling on a challenge lodged by the Chamber of Mines.

The announcement of the laws

in mid-June saw the rand slide two per cent and mining shares plunge, and prompted a warning from ratings agency Moody's that the new rules would deter investment, raise costs and diminish cashflow generation.

Meanwhile, stocks ticked up, led by buying coming back into Lonmin after it cut costs and boosted third quarter mining performance.

The benchmark JSE Top40 index ticked up 0.4 per cent to 4799.60

points, while the all share index gained 0.43 per cent to 53 827.41 points.

Lonmin's share price rose to its highest level in more than a month after buying came into the previously oversold platinum miner when it cut more costs and improved its mining performance in its third

Lonmin advanced 14.82 per cent to close at R12.86.

No cover up in alleged corruption - says SAA Board

JOHANNESURB - The South African Airways (SAA) board of directors yesterday assured the public that it would not cover up corruption at the state-owned airline following a Sunday newspaper report that it paid R4.5billion to overseas companies for long-term contracts.

The board also said action taken against anyone accused of criminality must have factual basis and be legally sustainable. "It is important to understand the status these reports enjoy within the business and the processes the company has embarked upon before conclusions are made on the basis of any aspect of such reports," it said.

Investigations were previously commissioned by SAA to look into financial losses incurred by the company. "The board has looked into those reports and concluded that, as matters stand, they are incomplete." It was finalising these reports, including soliciting input from all affected parties and executive management. BUSINESS REPORT

US fines BNP Paribas \$246m over forex oversight

WASHINGTON - US regulators on Monday fined French banking giant BNP Paribas \$246 million for poor oversight of its foreign exchange traders who manipulated trading prices.

The move came six months after the Federal Reserve permanently barred former BNP trader Jason Katz from the banking industry, for manipulating foreign exchange prices.

"The firm failed to detect and address that its traders used electronic chat rooms to communicate with competitors about their trading positions," the Fed said in a statement. "The Board's order requires BNP Paribas to improve its senior management oversight and controls relating to the firm's FX trading," the statement said.

Mahindra plans to double investment in US

NEW YORK - Indian conglomerate Mahindra Group plans to double its US investment in the next five years, where it is hoping its two - wheel electric scooters will win over American millennials.

"We're very bullish," Executive Chairman Anand Mahindra told reporters. "We're going to double our bets here."

The company plans \$1-billion (R12.96-billion) in additional investment, executives said.

Mahindra, which operates

globally in 10 sectors including aerospace, farm equipment and financial services, already has invested \$1-billion in the United States, where it has 3 000 employees.

The biggest group of workers is in information services with 2 300, which is projected to grow

to 5 000 as the company steps up recruitment at US universities.

The company also plans to make additional hires in North American tractors and autos, officials said. Mahindra said he was taking a

nuanced view of US environmental politics, planning to co-chair a climate summit with California Governor Jerry Brown in spite of President Donald Trump's vow to exit the Paris climate agreement.

"America is not just Washington DC. America is very complex."

The company manufactures a fleet of electric two-wheel bikes and scooters that executives described as potential transportation disruptors.

Mahindra's GenZe e-bike and e-scooter brand announced a partnership Monday with Postmates, an on-demand delivery system in New York and San Francisco that could be expanded to 200 cities. The scooters are produced at a plant in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

The vehicles are fast becoming more popular in Europe, though Mahindra Managing director Pawan Goenka conceded the US as a "car crazy country," remained a greater challenge.

Mahindra offered a strong endorsement of the Indian government's setting of a 2030 target for all-electric cars, although he said the objective was "aspirational."

"In India, we've suffered from a poverty of aspirations, not just a poverty of income," Mahindra said. But lower battery costs will help accelerate the uptake of electric cars, an essential outcome for India, he said.

He said the prospect of 250 to 300 million households owning conventional cars is "a nightmare for the globe, not just for India."

"You're going to have to move towards fleet sharing and you're going to have to move towards electric."

Direct selling sees exponential growth

JOHANNESBURG – Direct selling seems to be one of the fastest growing business models in South Africa, despite the country's depressed economy.

The industry has seen growth of 18 per cent in the last financial year.

Last year independent business owners collectively earned close to R5-billion.

South Africa's economy is facing headwinds – from a downgrade of the country's sovereign credit rating to a high unemployment rate of 26 per cent.

Business confidence is also at a low. But for those selling directly to the public, business is booming.

That's according to the Direct Selling Association which has 34 members.

The body represents popular brands like Avon, Justine and Tupperware.

The nearly R13-billion rand industry has over 1.3 million active sellers. Of those, 472 000 sell on a full-time basis. The Association's Ernest Du Toit said the business grew exponentially in the last financial year. "What we're seeing is a net growth in both the opportunity and the business opportunity and the person to person sales made and the number of people that are buying products. In fact in the health and beauty industry, research tells you that up to 57 per cent of all sales are done on personal endorsements face to face... grow well into the future," Du Toit said. He says the industry has seen a predominant growth of 35 per cent in Gauteng.

But there has also been growth in rural areas. Du Toit said this kind of business has seen success the world over, with the US generating over \$35-billion in 2016. eNCA

Waiting for Draghi only game for central banks orbiting ECB

FRANKFURT - As Europe's central banks forge a path out of extreme monetary policies, all roads go via Frankfurt.

Policy makers from Stockholm to Bucharest are now waiting for their colleagues at the European Central Bank (ECB) to kick off unwinding the record stimulus that was unleashed in the aftermath of the global financial crisis.

Tomorrow, they'll be watching for any new signals from President Mario Draghi, who hinted last month that the end of the road was approaching.

"The central banks are all waiting for Draghi to see how he develops his policy," said Janwillem Acket, chief economist at Julius Baer in Zurich. "They'll let the action take place in Frankfurt and then respond."

For smaller central banks, the wait-andsee mode can be chalked up to two main things: When interest rates hit rock bottom, the currency becomes the main tool to control inflation and the so-called rate differential comes into focus, and, despite rumors of its demise, Europe's economic integration is deepening.

Officials in Scandinavia and eastern Europe are all dealing with a lack of inflation even though their economies are very different. In Romania, where economic growth is topping five per cent, inflation is less than one per cent, and price growth is also slowing in Poland, where the central bank governor is quashing talk of an interest-rate hike. Sweden hasn't hit its two per cent target for more than half a decade, while inflation in the euro area has been below the ECB's goal since 2013.

Three national ministers fail to pitch at summit

CAPE TOWN - Student leaders attending the Schools and Campus Safety Summit disrupted a session after key government ministers failed to pitch, GroundUp reports.

Sassa CEO forced to resign-SCOPA chair

CAPE TOWN – SA Social Security Agency (SASSA) CEO Thokozani Magwaza was forced to resign following irreconcilable differences with Social Development Minister Bathabile Dlamini, Standing Committee on Public Accounts (SCOPA) Chairperson Themba Godi said on Monday afternoon.

"As far as I understand, Mr Magwaza was actually asked to leave because he did not see eye to eye with the minister," Godi told News24.

"Last week Mr Magwaza announced the disillusion of work streams which irregularly were appointed by the minister according to the treasury.

This led to increased tension between the CEO and the minister."

Godi could not say where he had received the information. In a statement on Monday, Dlamini said Magwaza resigned following a "consultative process" led by the Head of Legal Services Ad. ocate Nkosinathi Dladla.

"The department would like to thank Mr Magwaza for the role he played as the CEO of SASSA and wish him well in his future endeavours."

Magwaza did not respond to phone calls and messages from News24.

He reportedly received several death threats before his resignation. Godi previously condemned the intimidation of Magwaza, saying it was a way to "open the door for the looting of public funds".

Former social development Director general Zane Dangor resigned in March, citing a breakdown in the relationship between himself and Dlamini.

DA to lay criminal charges against SAP

JOHANNESBURG – The DA said on Monday it will file a criminal complaint against German software giant SAP over allegations of corruption involving friends of President Jacob Zuma.

SAP, Europe's top technology company, last week put four senior managers in South Africa on leave and opened an investigation into reports that dragged the company into an escalating influence-peddling scandal.

The company allegedly paid kickbacks to CAD House, a firm partlyowned by the politically connected Gupta family and Zuma's son Duduzane. The payments allegedly helped SAP clinch a deal worth R1billion with rail and logistics parastatal Transnet.

CAD House sells 3-D printers and has no software experience that would make it a logical go-between for SAP and Transnet. "The DA has reason to believe that SAP South Africa procured the services of CAD House purely because they wanted access

to its owners, Duduzane Zuma and the Guptas," the DA said in a statement

"The DA will, therefore, proceed to lay charges of corruption and money laundering against (SAP South Africa and CAD House)."

A Gupta spokesman, CAD House, SAP and a spokesman for Zuma did not immediately respond to requests for comment. The Guptas and Zuma previously denied wrongdoing.

SAP hired an independent international law firm based in the United States to conduct an external investigation and also will run its own internal inquiry. "We've obviously seen the claims in the media. And we're taking these extremely, very, very seriously." Adaire Fox-Martin, SAP co-President for global customer operations, told Reuters in an interview on July 12. Some members of the ANC called for Zuma to step down over allegations the Gupta family influenced government contracts and cabinet positions.

Tshwane to replace security guards with metro police

JOHANNESBURG – In a bid to cut costs, the City of Tshwane plans to replace outsourced security services with metro police.

Municipal buildings, licensing stations, parks and bus depots will soon be staffed by Tshwane metro police officers.

The move will save millions of rand. But the decision was not welcomed by security guards contracted to the city. They staged pickets outside the mayor's office to demand permanent employment.

Over 700 sites in the capital need security. In the past, guards from private firms did the job.

"We are not totally eliminating security guards. What we have done is look at our situation, at what we have and we are taking 10 187 metro police officers (who) are not totally trained at the moment, who need further training and we use them temporarily as security guards, then upskill them and bring them back to the TMPD (Tshwane Metro Police Department) while we start insourcing security guards going forward," said MMC for

Community Safety Derrick Kissoonduth. The security guards accused Mayor Solly Msimanga of making empty promises.

"Whether he likes it or not he will comply, we will force him because we are living in a democracy. So if he says we must sit down at home not working, what are going to eat, what about our people and children? The mayor is a coward, he is cruel he thinks for himself," said march organiser, Isaac Ngwenya.

The prospect of being replaced with metro police did not sit well with the protesters.

"It's a ridiculous move. How do you replace someone who's trained to do that job with someone who's not trained to do that job? If Solly's vision of taking the country forward is that, then he must step down," Austin Mofyoa of the Outsourcing Must Fall movement.

"We will be insourcing that's our intention however, it will be done fairly for all citizens so when we require more guards, then we will advertise post and employ people," said Kissoonduth. *eNCA*



THEY WERE DEAD BEFORE IT CRASHED'

MALAYSIA - The Malaysian Airlines plane was en route from Amsterdam to Kuala Lumpur on July 17, 2014, when it was hit by a surface-to-air missile reportedly fired by pro-Russian separatists.

The horrific disaster – coming just months after flight MH370 disappeared – came during intense fighting after the annexation of Crimea in March 2014.

All 283 passengers and 15 crew members died.

But on the three-year anniversary since the plane was shot down, outlandish conspiracies are being shared about the disaster.



The most shocking of these is one that claims the plane was actually filled with corpses when it took off in Amsterdam.

Pro-Russian rebel commander Igor Girkin – also known as Igor Strelkov – made the incredible claim while asking questions about the disaster.

Girkin is being sued by the families of a number of MH17 passengers over his alleged role in downing the plane.

Days after the disaster, he was quoted as saying: "According to the people who collected corpses, most of **PRO**-Russian rebel commander Igor Girkin alleges that people that went to the crash site found many of the corpses were absolutely bloodless.

"For the complete accuracy of the information can not answer—of course, it is necessary conclusion of forensic experts."


He also apparently said people that went to the crash site found many of the corpses were "absolutely bloodless".

Mob justice on Zim traffic cop

BULAWAYO - A video has emerged of one of Zimbabwe's despised traffic cops being pummelled by angry residents. Local reports say he caused a minibus carrying passengers to veer off the road and crash into a hardware store in Bulawayo. In the YouTube video taken moments after the accident, the cop tries to hurry away but is waylaid by angry pedestrians. Some of them punch his head and back. The policeman, who appears to have lost his cap but is still wearing his fluorescent green armbands, grey shirt and navy blue trousers, tries to deflect the blows. NEWS24

Militants kill 5 police in complex attack

EL-ARISH - Egyptian security officials say suspected Islamic militants have attacked police in the northern Sinai Peninsula, killing five of them and wounding another five. They say the militants opened fire on an army vehicle before setting it on fire in the city of el-Arish on Monday. When reinforcements arrived, the militants set off a roadside bomb. The officials spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorised to brief reporters. Egypt has been struggling to combat an insurgency in the northern Sinai that has gathered strength since the military overthrew Islamist president Mohammed Morsi in 2013. Most of the attacks, including an assault on an army post earlier this month that killed 23 soldiers, have been claimed by an Islamic State affiliate. AP

Malian soldiers' bodies recovered

BAMAKO - The bodies of eight missing Malian soldiers have been found following a

presumed jihadist attack on July 9, official sources told AFP. The soldiers were ambushed in Mali's northeast and two escaped with their lives,



but until now there had been no trace of the missing. "Eight soldiers missing after clashes with terrorists near Menaka have been found Monday killed by bullets," a senior army official told AFP. A local official in the area said eight bodies were found in Inkadogotane, 60 kilometres (37 miles) from the town of Menaka, and added that they were captured alive before being executed. AFP

Roadside explosion kills five policemen

ISMAILIA - Five Egyptian policemen were killed and six wounded on Monday by two roadside explosions in the restive Sinai Peninsula, security sources told Reuters. The five policemen were killed in the city of Arish, the capital of North Sinai province, when their armoured vehicle drove past a roadside bomb, the sources said. Three others were wounded. Another armoured vehicle rushed to the scene only for a second roadside bomb to go off, injuring three policemen. Militants planted the explosives and detonated them remotely as the vehicles drove by, the sources said. Reuters

Investigation begins into Senegal football

DAKAR - Senegalese prosecutors on Monday announced the opening of a judicial enquiry into a stadium tragedy, as a local team whose fans were accused of triggering a deadly stampede were suspended from the country's football federation. Multiple witnesses told AFP that US Ouakam fans threw stones and other objects at Stade de Mbour supporters when Mbour scored a goal to take a 2-1 lead in extra time during Senegal's League Cup final on Saturday.



'Grace Mugabe 'up and about' after freak accident'

HARARE - Zimbabwean First Lady Grace Mugabe is reportedly "on the mend" following an accident this past Saturday at the Harare International Airport that saw her sprain her ankle.

The state-owned Herald newspaper quoted the Presidential Press Secretary George Charamba as saying that by Sunday morning, Grace was "up and about".

Grace suffered minor injuries in an accident that involved the presidential motorcade over the weekend. The incident occurred shortly after President Robert and his wife landed back home after a week spent in Singapore, where Mugabe had gone for his third medical check-up this year.

As usual, the presidential limousine was waiting to whisk the First Family back to their Harare mansion. But the chauffeur set off before Grace Mugabe had got in, causing her to lose her balance. "The sudden movement of the vehicle saw Amai Mugabe withdraw her foot from

the car, and as she lost her balance, one shoe came off and was run over by a rear wheel," the state-run Sunday Mail said in a

Grace was treated at a local clinic before she was discharged.

Meanwhile, a prominent Zimbabwean pastor Patrick Mugadza said the First Lady's accident was "a message from God advising her to stop evicting villagers in Mazowe", according to New Zimbabwe.com.

The report said that the pastor recently visited hundreds of families who were evicted from Manzou farm by Grace and prayed for God's intervention in their plight.

Mugadza said that the evictees' tears "were now haunting the First Lady". Last week Grace moved to expand her Mazowe "empire" in Mashonaland province by grabbing the "iconic stateowned Mazowe Dam - almost a century after it was built - and surrounding tracts of land".

According to Zimbabwe Independent, the move had heightened her "bitter fights local villagers", who were now barred from using the huge dam, as she also wanted to privatise it.

Mazowe Dam was in the vicinity of Manzou farm where Grace's growing empire already included a huge double-storey mansion, a dairy farm, an orphanage and a school. NEWS24

Islamist attackers will be hunted down: Kenya President

NAIROBI - Kenya will use "deadly force" against suspected Islamist militants, President Uhuru Kenyatta said on Monday as he campaigned for re-election in Lamu, one of the regions that has borne the brunt of militant violence.

In the latest attack, suspected members of Somalia's al-Shabaab took a senior government official and five other people hostage in Lamu last Thursday. Two people died in a rescue operation by Kenyan forces.

"We shall bury them. Fire must be met with fire," Kenyatta said at a campaign rally, according to his press service. "Our citizens are losing their lives. Our security forces are losing their lives. My principal secretary was wounded here a few days ago... I have no apologies to make in taking the tough measures we are taking," he said.

Kenyatta is facing a stiff challenge from opposition leader Raila Odinga. High food prices worry most voters more than militant attacks, but security could be the issue for voters in the remote regions bordering Somalia.

Last week, the Kenya military said it had conducted air strikes on Lamu's Boni forest after the string of attacks blamed on the militants in the area. Al-Shabaab is fighting to topple Somalia's Western-backed government and establish its own rule, based on the group's strict interpretation of sharia law. Reuters

ANGOLA REJECTS EU POLL

LUANDA - Angola rejected conditions demanded by an EU election observer mission that had been preparing to witness next month's polls in the country, state media reported Monday.

The European team had called for unfettered access to polling stations across the vast southern African nation during the August 23 vote.

"So this is Africa. And we do not expect anyone to impose on us their means of observing elections or to give lectures," said Foreign Minister Georges Chicoti according to the Journal de Angola newspaper.

"The invitation stands. But we do not want to have separate agreements with all of the organisations (sending observers)." Chicoti added that the only organisations with which Angola has election observation deals were the African Union and the southern African bloc SADC. "These are the only institutions for which Angola must abide by the electoral processes laid down in law," he said. The foreign ministry warned that safety could be an issue if the EU observers were allowed unhindered access to polling stations in all 18 of Angola's provinces. AFP

Egypt ends visa-free entry for Qataris

CAIRO - Egypt will end visa-free entry for Oatari nationals with some exceptions, the Egyptian Foreign Ministry said on Monday, the latest measure taken against Doha which Cairo and three Gulf governments are boycotting.

Saudi Arabia, the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain and Egypt imposed sanctions on Oatar on June 5, cutting diplomatic and transport ties with the tiny Gulf monarchy, after accusing it of financing militant groups and allying with their regional arch-foe

Doha denied the accusations.

"It does not make sense to keep making exceptions for Qatar and giving it privileges in light of its current positions," said Foreign Ministry spokesman Ahmed Abu Zeid. Qatari nationals will now have to apply for a visa in order to enter Egypt.

Qatari nationals with Egyptian mothers,

those married to Egyptians, and Qataris studying in Egypt will be exempt from having to apply for a visa, he added.

Sources at Cairo International Airport told Reuters the decision would be imple mented as of tomorrow, which the Qatari Foreign Ministry later confirmed on Twitter.

Make up

Foreign workers make up around 1.6 million of Qatar's 2.5 million population, and hundreds of thousands of them are Egyptians, making them one of the biggest foreign contingents in the Gulf country.

So far no action has been taken against them. Foreign Minister Sameh Shoukry told his Kuwaiti counterpart earlier on Monday that Egypt is standing by the list of demands it and the three Gulf countries made of Qatar and will keep sanctions against Doha in place.

Somalia's internet returns after 3-week outage caused outcry

HARGEISA - Authorities capital, Mogadishu. The say Somalia's internet has returned after an outage of more than three weeks cost the Horn of Africa nation about \$10 million a day.

Hormuud Telecom, Somalia's largest telecom company, announced the restoration of service in a message to subscribers on Monday.

The loss of internet service sparked anger across Somalia and affected the central and southern parts of the country including the government called it a "major disaster"

Officials and internet providers attributed the problem to a commercial ship that they said cut an undersea cable.

Major companies reported millions of dollars in revenue losses. University studies were disrupted.

The internet outage also stranded patients who were seeking medical attention abroad as they couldn't access online paperwork.



Parole board to decide OJ Simpson's fate

LOS ANGELES - Former American football star OJSimpson has spent nearly nine years in prison.

Not for the grisly 1994 murders of his exwife and a male companion - he was famously acquitted in that case.

No, Simpson has been behind bars for his role in a September 2007 armed robbery of two sports memorabilia dealers at a Las Vegas resort.

He could soon go free.

A Nevada parole board will hold a hearing in Carson City tomorrow to decide whether the former National Football League (NFL) star and actor should be released from prison.

Simpson was convicted in October 2008 of armed robbery, assault, kidnapping and other offenses after he and five associates - two of whom were armed - ambushed the two sports memorabilia dealers in a casino hotel

Simpson (70) who earned the nickname "The Juice" during his playing days, claimed he was just trying to recover mementos from his career which he said the dealers had stolen.

A Las Vegas jury didn't buy it and Simpson was sentenced to a minimum of nine years in prison and a maximum of 33 years.

Simpson was granted parole in 2013 on some of the charges and he could be freed as early as 1 October if the board agrees tomorrow to grant him parole on the remaining offenses. Former Clark County district attorney David Roger, who led the 2008 prosecution of Simpson, said he is likely to be given his freedom.

7.1 million Venezuelans vote in opposition referendum

CARACAS - Venezuelan's opposition said more than 7.1 million people responded to its call to vote on Sunday in a symbolic rejection of President Nicolas Maduro's plan to rewrite the Constitution, a proposal that has raised tensions in a nation suffering through widespread shortages and months of anti-government protests.

A 61-year-old woman was killed and four people wounded by gunfire that erupted after government supporters on motorcycles swarmed an opposition polling site in a church in the traditionally pro-government Catia neighbourhood of western Caracas. Analysts said the vote for the opposition across Venezuela and the country's far-flung diaspora was an impressive show of support. However, it fell short of the opposition's 7.7 million-vote showing in 2015 legislative elections and the 7.5 million votes that brought Maduro to power in 2013. Opposition leaders said that was because it was only able to set up 2 000 polling places in a largely symbolic exercise that the government labelled as illegitimate. Still, some supporters said they were disappointed.

"I thought it was going to be more," said Mariela Arana, a 56-year-old school counsellor. "But these seven million people spoke and it was plenty."



WON'T ROLL ED CARPET FOR DONALD TRUMP

LONDON - Sadiq Khan has warned Donald Trump that there will be 'no red carpet' should he visit the United Kingdom.

The Mayor of London renewed his war of words with the US President ahead of a proposed state visit to the capital.

Theresa May had officially invited Trump to the UK in January but the trip was left out of the Queen's Speech last month, ending hopes it would happen this year. Despite an invite from the UK government, both sides have failed to arrange a date amid reports that Trump has been put off by the threat of large-scale protests. Among the President's main opponents in the UK has been Khan, who opposed Trump's travel ban which targeted peo-

Speaking to CNN about the mooted state visit, Khan said he was 'ready to play my role' when it came to challenging people's opinions. He added: 'State visits are different from a normal visit and at a time when the President of the USA has policies that many in our country disagree with, I am not sure it is appropriate for our government to roll out the red carpet. 'If you somehow think it is not possible to be a Muslim and a proud westerner I am happy to disabuse you of that idea, whether you are a reporter for CNN or Donald Trump.' The pair have a colourful history, most notably in the aftermath of the London Bridge terror attack when Trump criticised the Mayor of London in a

The President attacked Khan after he had told Londoners there was 'no reason to be alarmed' by the increased police presence in the capital. Trump also said of Mr Khan: 'I think they were very rude statements and frankly tell him I will remember those statements.' He is said to have told the Prime Minister in a phone call earlier this month that he does not want to go ahead with the trip until the British public supports him coming.

"The United States will not stand by as Venezuela crumbles," Trump said in a statement. "If the Maduro regime impos-

es its Constituent Assembly on

July 30, the United States will take strong and swift economic actions," he said, without elaborating on what those actions

Trump praised the Venezuelan opposition's unsanctioned Sunday vote that saw millions of voters reject Maduro's plan, saying "their strong and courageous actions continue to be ignored by a bad leader who dreams of becoming a dictator".

The Mizan article said he was born in Beijing and entered Iran as a researcher. It pointed to graduate studies he did at Princeton University in 2013 and 2014, and described him as a fluent speaker of Persian. AP

Bottles hurled at chaotic German town

BERLIN - German police said on Monday several assaults and cases of sexual harassment were reported in alcohol-fuelled weekend disturbances that saw youths rampage through a small town and hurl bottles at police. No arrests had been made over the alleged harassment, but police were treating as a suspect a 20-year-old Iraqi man and, in a separate case in which a 17year-old girl was groped, three Afghan asylum seekers aged 18-20. Police Chief Roland Eisele urged other women to come forward if they were abused last Friday or Saturday night during the chaotic scenes that started at a local festival in the southwestern town of Schorndorf, Baden-Wuerttemberg state. AFP

Man acquitted of murder

NEW YORK - A man charged with killing a stranger by pushing him into the path of a New York City subway train has been acquitted of murder. A Manhattan jury issued the verdict on Monday at the trial of Naeem Davis, who said he had acted in self-defence. He said Ki-Suck Han was the drunken instigator of the deadly altercation on a train platform near Times Square in December 2012. Davis said that after they bumped into each other, Han followed him down the platform, berated him with obscenities, grabbed his shoulder and hurled death threats. Prosecutors brought a murder charge against Davis, arguing he had shown a "depraved indifference" to Han's life. The New York Times reports that the jury foreperson hugged Davis as he left the courtroom. AP

Court confirms Jehovah's Witnesses ban

MOSCOW

Russia's Supreme Court Monday confirmed a ban on Jehovah's Witnesses, labelled by authorities as an "extremist



organisation"." The Russian Supreme Court has decided to reject the appeal of the organisation against its ban," the court, quoted by RIA-Novosti news agency, said in its decision. In April, the court issued a ruling banning the Christian group and seizing its property. That decision came after the justice ministry said it had found signs of "extremist activity" within the religious movement and requested that it be banned.

6.4 magnitude earthquake hits Peru

LIMA - A 6.4 magnitude earthquake struck just off Peru's southern coast on Monday, the US Geological Survey said, with no immediate reports of injuries or damage. The quake hit at approximately 9.05pm with a depth of 44 kilometres. It occurred some 220 kilometres west of Arequipa, Peru's second most populous city. Though there was no initial evidence of damage the tremor provoked alarm among Peruvians, with the Mayor of the southern town of Caraveli saying residents there had taken to the streets." The tremor has been very strong here in Caraveli," Mayor Santiago Neyra said. AFP

Doctors find 27 lenses in woman's eye

LONDON - Doctors intending to perform cataract surgery on a 67-year-old woman in Britain found something rather unexpected: 17 contact lenses mashed together in her right eye. In a case report published Monday in the British Medical Journal, the doctors said that the woman had worn monthly disposable contact lenses for 35 years; she had "deep set eyes" and poorer vision in that eye, which they said might have contributed to a failure to remove some of the lenses. The doctors said the 17 lenses were bound together by mucus. A further 10 were found by the surgeon using a microscope. AP

MADRID - The president of the Spanish Football Federation, Angel Maria Villar, was detained by police yesterday as part of a corruption probe, a judicial source said.

Villar, 67, a former Spanish international footballer, was being held on suspicion of abusing his position to embezzle funds from the federation, among other charges, the source said.

Villar's son Gorka and another federation official were also detained in the probe which notably focuses on allegations of skimming profits from international matches, the source told AFP.

Spain's political and financial crimes court said it is directing the probe into allegations of "collusion, fraud, embezzlement and presumed forgery."

Police who carried out raids on the federation headquarters and other locations related to the probe said that Villar is suspected of organising international football matches as part of a scheme to embezzle profits for the benefit of his son.

LONDON - Arsenal goalkeeper Wojciech Szczesny has arrived in Turin for his medical with Serie A giants Juventus ahead of the final touches to his summer transfer.

FEDERER LAMENTS LACK OF NEXT GENERATION

LONDON - Roger Federer was over the moon after claiming his record eighth Wimbledon title this past Sunday and partied well into the night.

But once the hangover had receded, the greatest player of his generation was left to wonder why he is still able to win grand slam titles at the grand old age of 35.

With Federer claiming both the Australian Open and Wimbledon this year and fellow veteran Rafael Nadal taking the Roland Garros crown, the Swiss ace questioned why the next generation of tennis pros has yet to step up.

Admitted

He admitted that the failure of tennis's next generation the likes of Milos Raonic, Grigor Dimitrov, Bernard Tomic and others in their mid-20s - to come through in grand slams was good for him.

"Every generation definitely is different," Federer said.



"Since my generation and Rafa's generation, the next one hasn't been strong enough to push all of us out really, so that has been helpful for us to stick around."

Describing

Federer also took a shot at the playing style of many of today's pros, describing their reluctance to approach the net as "frightening"

"I have played almost every player here that wouldn't serve and volley. It's frightening to see this at this level. I look at the stats and go into whichever round it is and see that the guy I'm going to face is playing two per cent of serve and volley throughout the championships. I'm going, 'OK, I know he's not going to serve and volley', which is great," Federer said.

"Then we are talking about grass, it was playing fast this week (compared with the first week). I wish that we would see more players taking chances up at the net because good things do happen there. You want to be there and have to spend some time up there to feel confident and good there." Sport24

Barcelona reject Roma approach for Munir



BARCA '200%' CERTAIN **NEYMAR WILL STAY**

BARCELONA - Barcelona Vice-President Jordi Mestre insisted yesterday that Brazilian star Neymar will be staying in Spain despite rumours linking him with a move to Paris Saint-Germain.

Asked during a press conference if he could confirm Neymar would remain at Barca ahead of the 2017-18 season, Mestre replied: "200 per cent".

Suggested

Reports in Spain have suggested PSG are looking to lure the 25year-old to the Parc des Princes after snapping up Neymar's international teammate Dani Alves on a free transfer.

"PSG want to finalise the signing of Neymar this summer", wrote Catalan daily Sport, while the Madrid-based AS newspaper led with the headline "Neymar flirts with PSG".

PSG are reportedly attempting to take advantage of Neymar's desire to step out of Lionel Messi's shadow, with the French club prepared to build a team around the Brazil forward.

"In the background of Neymar's annoyance there's always a concern, which has to do with his role in the team and his wish to become a leader," wrote Sport.

"But you have to be aware that there are no shortcuts to leadership and it is something that is earned slowly, naturally and progressively," it added.

According to Marca, PSG would be willing to stump up the 222 million euros (R3.3 billion) required to trigger Neymar's release clause and would offer him a five-year deal worth 30-plus million euros

However, a report in French sports daily L'Equipe yesterday quoted a PSG club source as saying: "We're not going to repeat the Neymar show. There is a huge release clause and you have to be realistic."

PSG have previously been linked with Neymar only for the striker to pen a new five-year deal with Barca last October.

LOS ANGELES - Romelu Lukaku bagged his first goal in a Manchester United shirt on Monday as the 10man Premier League giants labored to a 2-1 victory over Real Salt Lake in Utah.

Lukaku, who joined the Red Devils from Everton in a reported £75m transfer last week, fired United ahead on 38 minutes, latching on to a low cross from Henrikh Mkhitaryan.

The 24-year-old Belgian international striker had also been involved in United's equaliser scored by Mkhitaryan in the 29th minute after Luis Silva had given Salt Lake a shock early lead.

Lukaku used his strength and physical presence to hold off the Real defence to feed Jesse Lingard, who provided the pass for Mkhitaryan to score.

Striker

United Manager Jose Mourinho was pleased with Lukaku's display, saying the former Chelsea player was now a "top striker."

"It's just nice for him, not important





We are going for Transversal Cup honours— Chaminuka



"We are also appealing for the same support from the football association as they are better placed to help us with the needed exposure. For example, we could curtain raise for the big games in the elite league such as the derby.


Awareness

Suspended

"We have been told that that we will be suspended for snubbing the national team camp. It is fortunate that there are officials who feel this is the best solution and have not bothered to find out the reason behind our actions. There are a number of things happening in the team and suspending players will not solve them," he said.


Another player said they
