



PEU DIRECTOR GRILLED OVER GOOD SHEPHERD

PUBLIC Enterprise Unit (PEU) Director Busangani Mkhaliphi had it tough yesterday when the PAC grilled her over Good Shepherd Hospital.

Mkhaliphi was summoned by the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) to explain how Good Shepherd Hospital, which is situated in Siteki, had gone for nine months without a board of directors.

The PEU is a government section under the ministry of finance.

This section is responsible for monitoring the operations of all public enterprises. Public enterprises can be described as companies that belong to government or companies where government has a majority shareholding or control. Public enterprises are also referred to as parastatals.

Members of the PAC wanted to know what the PEU did when Good Shepherd had no board of directors for such a long time.

The members of the PAC, which was hot under the collar over this issue, stated that they could not let this issue go

because the taxpayers had given E360 million to Good Shepherd to transfer its workers to become fully-fledged civil servants. Mkhaliphi, in response to the concerns of the PAC, stated that they informed ministers responsible for the affected parastatals.

"We inform them even during Cabinet meetings where we, as the PEU, form part of the Secretariat of Cabinet," Mkhaliphi said.

She went on to state that they even informed Ministry of Health Principal Secretary Dr. Simon Zwane about this.

Such a response was not enough to convince the PAC, which then wanted written proof to show that the PEU informed the ministry of health about the absence of a board of directors at Good Shepherd.

Mkhaliphi could not produce written proof to support that they told the ministry of health about the board absence at Good Shepherd. She admitted that it was not good for them, as a unit, to communicate informally with ministries when something happened to their parastatals.

Nkhaba MP Menzi Dlamini, who was seemingly irked by such a statement, said it was not good for PEU to communicate informally about formal structures, which were funded by taxpayers, who worked so hard for the money they were taxed. He then challenged Mkhaliphi to go and familiarise herself with the PEU Act of 1989 in order to know what was expected of her.

PAC Chairperson Thuli Dladla advised Mkhaliphi to always nag ministers and principal secretaries if something wrong was happening in parastatals. She told her not to be just quiet because at the end it was her that was to be seen as an inefficient person.

Minister too busy to appoint board

MINISTER of Health Sibongile Simelane has been committed with other national duties to appoint the Good Shepherd Hospital board of directors.

This transpired yesterday during the PAC session where the ministry of health appeared before the government financial watchdog (PAC).

Ministry of Health Principal Secretary Dr. Simon Zwane told the PAC that the Ndlela-Simelane could have been held up by some other national commitments and could not appoint the board.

When Zwane was still making his remarks the issue of the board to the PAC, it transpired that the board could have been appointed as early as January this year.

However, such was not to happen. The PS said when it was realised that the Good Shepherd board had to be appointed, the Good Shepherd mission and the government had to nominate their candidates.

After the nominations were done by both parties, the nominees had to be vetted by the police.

The police did the vetting in January this year. After the vetting was done, the papers would then be taken to ministers.

"What is unfortunate is that the

papers cannot be discussed when the substantive minister is not there. The vetting was done early this year. Maybe the board could not be appointed then because the minister could have been busy," Zwane said.

Hosea Member of Parliament (MP) Thulani Masuku, who is also a PAC member, did not accept what was said by Zwane.

He stated that such could not be a good reason that could delay the appointment of the board.

"Appointing people into positions is not a tough task that needs a lot of time from someone. Such an explanation is not acceptable because all the minister had to do was to call names of certain people into the board." Masuku said.

Government owes E234 million in drugs

GOVERNMENT is in a dire situation as it owes E234 million to suppliers that supply drugs to public health facilities in the country.

This transpired yesterday during a session of the House of Assembly. The Members of Parliament (MPs) wanted to know why medication had run out in hospitals and clinics. Lobamba MP Michael Masilela stood up on Standing Order Number 58 and moved a motion without notice.

The motion compelled Minister for Health Sibongile Simelane to ensure the availability of drugs in hospitals within seven days.

Masilela's motion was debated by about 15 MPs. They raised many issues that the minister needed to look into as she addressed the shortage of drugs in hospitals. They told the minister to also address the shortage of material for health practitioners to execute their duties to help the nation.

They also wanted to know why the ministry of health suddenly found itself in debts because they had allocated a

huge amount of money to the ministry, which was more than E1 billion. They allocated that money in February this

They wanted to know if the money they passed was real money or it was just numbers. Unfortunately, they could not get that answer from Minister for Finance Martin Dlamini, who was also present yesterday in the House.

Status

Mayiwane MP Sifiso Eric Matsebula and Ntfonjeni MP Sompisi Magagula wondered if the country was still going to achieve first world status under such circumstances. They said the people had the zeal to work towards achieving such a status in communities, but were disturbed by the unfortunate circumstance of the shortage of medication.

Somntongo MP Sandile Nxumalo advised the minister to also look into the issue of lack of human resources and material within hospitals and clinics. Manzini North MP Jan Sithole said it was a fundamental right for Swazis

to access good medical care and government had to ensure that the problem was solved.

Mbabane East MP Esther Dlamini was supported by his Mbabane West counterpart Johane Shongwe.

They told the minister that the situation was tough at Mbabane Government Hospital. Each time they went there, the people would complain to them because of the tough situation they faced. Ngwemphisi MP Veli Shongwe urged the minister to investigate if health practitioners did not establish their own chemists and pharmacies, which could tempt them to steal the drugs to sell at their outlets.

Minister for Health Sibongile Simelane promised to work on the matter. Simelane, who was emotional in her response, asked for the MPs to cooperate with her on the matter. He thanked his fellow ministers for working with her on the matter.

She said in January, government owed E400 million to the suppliers, but now, E230 million was owed.

I would have charged govt E800 000 - Santa Lucia boss

SANTA Lucia Director Themba Makhanya said he would have charged the ministry of health E800 000, but chose to charge E767 000.

Makhanya said this yesterday when he appeared before the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) to give his side of the story on the E767 000 he is said to owe government. The director said his company entered into an agreement with the Mbabane Government Hospital, under the ministry of health, back in 2006. Their agreement was that the ministry of health would use Santa Lucia mortuary to keep dead bodies for a period of a month.

Makhanya told the PAC that the ministry brought nine bodies of adults and one body of a child.

The 10 bodies, according to Makhanya, were at a decomposing state. He charged E250 for each body per day. Makhanya stated that he was very cheap because other mortuaries charged hire fees for a body in a day. He said they charged from E400 to E600 in a day.

"We took the bodies and we found

ourselves having to keep the bodies for nine months. We anticipated that government would come to claim the bodies after the nine months, but we had to keep the bodies for another 30 days," Makhanya said. He further told PAC that the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) and the police came to him to talk about the issue five months ago. However, they could not apprehend him because he explained everything to them.

However, Makhanya could not produce a written document to prove that he entered into an agreement with the Mbabane Government Hospital. Instead, he furnished the PAC with a letter of agreement he signed with Pigg's Peak Government Hospital. The PAC did not accept this and they told Makhanya to come back with all the documents supporting the deal they had entered into with the ministry.

He was asked to bring his partner in business, whom he referred to as a certain Mrs Nkambule. He also promised to appear before the PAC with other managers that were present when the deal was signed.

ST THERESA'S PRIMARY CLASSES START AT 6AM

THE ministry of education has launched investigations on St Theresa's Primary School for starting classes as early as 6am for Grade 7 pupils.

A team of officers from the ministry here yesterday tasked to assess the situation on the ground after the there were complaints by parents that school started as early 6am. Information gathered by this publication is that parents were aggrieved by the school's decision to start school early especially now that it is winter.

The parents who took to social media said they understood that the school wanted to maintain its record of being the best in the country come January, but 6am was a bit too early for the children especially because the winter season had begun. Principal Secretary Pat Muir when asked on government's stand on the matter said they received com-

plaints from concerned citizens and he had in turn commissioned a team to go to the school to investigate the matter.

Muir said he was aware that schools in a quest to extra prepare pupils for exams tend to add extra hours of school and they didn't object to that but said they were however worried in this case.

"We also want good results, but teachers need to be reasonable and considerate," he said.

He said schools would rather end classes late than start early.

"We are aware primaries knock off between 1 and 2pm, they would rather have the classes until 3pm," he said.

Muir argued that 3pm was a reasonable time to end classes for primary school pupils.

Principal at the school Ben Dlamini said this was initiated by parents who wanted their children to be afforded more time to study.

"I don't believe this complaint was made by parents since they

were the ones who asked that we allow pupils to use school facilities as early as 6am," he said.

Dlamini explained that no teaching took place at this time; instead pupils used this time to study.

He further explained that it was not mandatory for the pupils to come to school at this time. He said, however, if this was causing confusion he would speak to teachers today and this would come to an end.

"We don't want to cause confusion," he said.

Your weekend will be warm and sunny



POPULAR BUSINESSMAN SHOOTS HIMSELF DEAD

POPULAR businessman Timothy Dlamini (50) yesterday shot himself dead.

Dlamini is alleged to have shot himself while at his house and was found with two bullet wounds on his right cheek.

Information gathered is that the businessman shot himself at around 4am yesterday.

It is said his wife heard a gunshot in one of the bedrooms of his mansion which is situated at eSiyeni area and when she went to see what was going on she found her husband lying in a pool of blood.

The businessman was rushed to hospital where he was certified dead upon

did not even leave a suicide note. When this publication visited the homestead yesterday morning, the situation was tense as family members had already gathered at the homestead.

Some family members included well known public figures. Efforts to get a comment on what transpired proved futile as none of the family members wanted to speak on the issue.

Those who spoke to the publication stated that it was still too early to comment as they were still in shock. An

elder of the family who addressed the media politely asked that they be given some space as a family.

The elder stated that as a family they did not have much to say because they were still waiting for a report from the police. He further added that police came at night and did their job and left.

He said they could not say anything as a family because the deceased's wife who was present said she did not see anything as she just heard gunshots.

"We are still waiting for the police to report back to us, for now we cannot say anything as the police are still to do forensics," the family member stated.

Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba confirmed the incident.

Mamba said police were investigating a matter whereby a 50-year-old man is suspected to have committed suicide by shooting himself yesterday morning

Mamba stated that the businessman was found with bullet wounds on his cheek.

Businessman had planned trip to SA

A family member who was overheard speaking on the phone with another person said he was shocked to learn of such news because all he knew was that the deceased was supposed to go to South Africa yesterday morning. The family member was heard saying more puzzling was that the deceased didn't even leave a suicide note and did not mention anything about having problems or anything.

Suicides a cause for concern - Ndo

CLINICAL Psychologist Ndo Mdlalose has stated that cases of suicide are a cause for concern in the country.

When probed on whether cases of people who commit suicide without leaving notes are normal, Mdlalose said they were.

She said it usually means the person had a strong desire to commit suicide and doesn't want to be bothered.

Mdlalose said not leaving suicide notes is common with men who prefer not to express their feelings or share their problems with others as they think that it will show a sign of weakness.

She said usually people who leave suicide notes are those that have not made up their minds and may want to be stopped from what they were planning to do.

The clinical psychologist stated that people have also come to the realisation that insurance companies no longer pay out benefits for members who have committed suicide so people no longer leave suicide notes.



GOVT WANTS PROVIDENT FUND FOR DRIVERS, CONDUCTORS

MINISTER of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula has pleaded with public transport owners to remit provident fund for their drivers and conductors.

She said this was important because their work environment was highly risky in nature, which makes them more vulnerable.

Adding, she said they also change their jobs often, "each time something happens or when they change or lose their jobs, they go home empty handed.'

The minister was speaking during the first day of the first annual stakeholder's forum hosted by the Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) yesterday at Esibayeni Lodge in Matsapha. Amongst those who were present were the executive members of the Swazi Commercial Amadoda.

The minister urged them to go back and have serious deliberations over the issue. She said it should be the same case with domestic workers. She said her ministry was also currently in negotiations with their South African counterparts to facilitate for the provident fund deductions of Swazi migrant workers residing in the Republic to be remitted directly to the Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF).

"It should be the same case for South Africans working in the country, their provident fund deductions should be remitted to their native fund administrators," she said.

She said this would significantly improve social security for workers."We are working towards that

with our South African counterparts and we hope that we will soon reach a consensus," she said.

Magagula said since they had seen the capacity of SNPF, they cannot introduce a new provident fund. "what we can do is to look at the regulations and legislation so that the SNPF can receive the deductions." The minister said this arrangement could be convenient for beneficiaries as the SNPF has stretched its branch network almost all over the country.

SNPF Chief Executive Officer Prince Lonkhokhela said they have branches in Manzini, Matsapha, Mbabane, Nhlangano, Piggs Peak and Siteki.

He said they also have agencies in Mankayane, Simunye and Big Bend. These he said could be turned to fully fledged branches anytime depending on the need to do so. The minister said they have set a July deadline to see if the South African government would support their proposal.

SECURITY GUARDS DEMAND 7% HIKE FROM MINISTER WII

SWAZILAND Amalgamated Trade Unions (SATU) has given Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula a seven-day ultimatum to address workers' demands, including a seven per cent wage increase.

SATU represents security guards in the country.

The petition, addressed to the minister, was delivered yesterday morning at the ministry of labour by the union's executive accompanied by over 200 security guards. The petition was received by acting Under Secretary Gugu Ginindza.

Addressing the workers and the representatives from the ministry, SATU Secretary General Frank Mncina demanded that the minister addresses the workers' concerns to and publish the wages Some of the songs that were sang during the march

order for the private security industry.

"Government convened a wagescouncil meeting which sought to improve terms and conditions of service for the industry including a wage increase," said Mncina, adding that the meeting was concluded on March 2.

He said the delay to issue or publish the wages order has continuously deprived the workers of their annual increase as they still rely on the wages council outcomes. SATU demanded the following from the Minister of Labour and Social Security, Winnie Magagula:

1. That the wages order be published with immediate effect and without further delays.

2. That the minister sticks to March 1, 2017 as an implementing date for the gazette as previously agreed by the council. They have given the minster seven days as an ultimatum to respond to these demands. Should these demands not be addressed sufficiently in the said period, the union will be left with no option but to prepare for a full-blown strike for security guards. The also requested that the minister increases the wages by a seven per cent. Acting Under Secretary at the Ministry of Labour and Social Security Gugu Ginindza assured SATU that the petition will be handed to the ministry as soon as possible. "I can assure SATU that their demands will be addressed as soon as possible," she said, assuring the security guards that the petition was in good hands.

Over 200 guards complain of being paid peanuts

SECURITY guards working in Mbabane demonstrated for what they termed as poor pay despite the high cost of living in the country.

The more than 200 guards marched from Swaziland Broadcasting Information Services (SBIS) to the ministry of labour and social security to address their griev-

According to the guards, who spoke to the Swazi Observer, they want a salary increment from their current basic salary to be increased by seven per cent, which they say has not been reviewed for more than a decade.

They were carrying placards, singing

SD, FAO SIGN E252.7M FIVE-YEAR PROGRAMME

THE Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO) has signed a five-year Country **Programming Framework** (CPF) worth E252.7 million with the kingdom.

The programme will focus on the attainment of food and nutrition security; market-led agricultural production and processing and sustainable use of natural resources and climate change adaptation between 2016 and 2020.

The agreement was signed on behalf of government by Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati and FAO Representative for Swaziland and Sub-regional Coordinator for Southern Africa David Phiri on Wednesday.

Vilakati said the CPF represents the commitment of FAO to assist government in its efforts to achieve national development objectives and to achieve food and nutrition security for the population.

He said the CPF will be jointly implemented by government and FAO with support from

the wider spectrum of stakeholders within the private sector, semi government institutions and civil society.

Vilakati said the CPF was aligned to the country's national development objectives that were articulated in the National Development Strategy (NDS), the National Agricultural Investment Programme (SNAIP), the Comprehensive Africa Agriculture Development Programme (CAADP), the United Nations Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF) and FAO's global, regional and subregional objectives.

"The implementation of the CPF would lead to an increased productivity and food security as well as growth in employment creation for socio-economic development," said the

He said the framework would promote the establishment of food and nutrition gardens, sustainable food production techniques as well as facilitate improved dietary standards and regulations.

It will also focus on the development of agricultural value chains and programmes that are expected to attract smallholder farmers to adopt a business approach towards agriculture.

Resilience

"The framework focuses on building resilience of ruralbased smallholder farmers so that they are capacitated to prepare for, respond to and recover from the effects of climate variability and other disasters. It will promote coping strategies to disasters; encourage the establishment of food reserves and the improvement of land productivity," said Vilakati.

Phiri said the FAO was already implementing the climate-smart agriculture programme in the

country, with the aim of sustainably increasing agricultural productivity and incomes, adapting and building resilience to climate change and reducing and/or removing greenhouse gas emissions, where possible. He said the organisation has already sourced about E53.2 million out of the required E252.7million.

"We will continue working with government to mobilise the remaining E199.5 million through the FAO Technical Corporation Programme (TCP), trust funds from development partners as well as from government's budgetary allocations," said Phiri.

Implementation

Vilakati and Phiri also signed an agreement that will pave the way for the implementation of a South-South cooperation project worth almost E3.1 million funded by the government of Morocco.

He welcomed the project, saying it would strengthen the capacity of the country's agricultural sector, with particular focus on livestock, irrigation and water management and

horticulture.

"Swaziland will benefit from Morocco's experience in water governance, modernisation of irrigation systems, horticultural production, open field cultivation, the use of hybrid crop varieties and livestock production and marketing," he said.






FIVE FACTORS DRIVING VIOLENCE AGAINST CHILDREN IDENTIFIED

FIVE factors have been identified as the main reason for violence against children in the country.

These factors have been uncovered by a national study on the drivers of violence against children in Swaziland. The report was yesterday disseminated by stakeholders at the Happy Valley.

Deputy Prime Minister's Office Statistician Choice Ginindza said the comprehensive study on violence against children identified that the five key factors that drive violence as negative gender norms and inequality, economic and social policies that increase poverty, HIV and AIDS epidemic, formal and informal systems that inhibit disclosure, access and follow up on violence experiences and the family and community norm around 'Tibitendlu' or secrets.

Ginindza said these five drivers impact on children's individual vulnerability, on the quality of relationships in the home, school and the community, on the stress and capacity of adults to care for children and on the community and institutional responses for violence.

He further states that Swaziland is the first country to map these drivers of violence at the institution-

al and structural levels that create the conditions in which violence is more likely to occur onto to strategies that are likely or proven to be effective at preventing violence.

The statistician further made a startling revelation that Swaziland has the highest prevalence of sexual violence during childhood compared to other countries that have done similar surveys. The findings of the study revealed that in Swaziland the prevalence of sexual violence prior to the age of 18 by female stands at 38 per cent. The study was conducted in nine countries.

Swaziland is closely followed by Zimbabwe at 33 per cent, then Kenya at 32 per cent. Cambodia had the lowest prevalence with 4 per cent, while Zambia is at 20 per cent and Nigeria is at 25 per cent.

Revealed

The study further revealed that the Swazi notion of 'tibitend-lu' (loosely translated to keeping it within the family), leads to many risk factors that may prevent children from telling anyone about violence. It further states that it keeps community and family members from intervening when they see a child being harmed. 'Tibitendlu' gives the perpetrators a sense of impunity, such that they can continue abusing children without consequences.



'VIOLENCE, HIV ARE LINKED'

UNITED States Ambassador to Swaziland, Lisa Peterson has pointed out that there is a link between violence in children and HIV.

The ambassador said aside from health and economic challenges resulting from violence against children, there is a strong and direct link between all forms of violence in childhood and HIV. "We know that children who have HIV, live with an HIV-infected parent or guardian, or have been orphaned as a result of HIV face an increased risk of violence and abuse," she said. Peterson said the national study on the drivers of violence against children comes at a critical time for Swaziland, as violence against women and children is increasing.

She said the information learnt from the study will be essential to preventing, rather than just responding to, the drivers of violence. "I hope that the study allows stakeholders to better understand the social norms behind these elevated levels of violence and to redouble their efforts to protect and treat those most susceptible to harm," she said.

The ambassador said she hopes the study would provide the impetus to finally pass the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill, which would help stem the tide of violent acts currently committed with impunity. "Without the full support and coordination of Swaziland's legislative and judicial systems, many of our collective efforts will fall short, trapping youth and families in a cycle of violence," she said. Peterson further revealed that since launching in Swaziland, PEPFAR has devoted tremendous resources to combat the twin tragedies of violence against children and gender-based violence. She said their efforts have largely focused on the practical response to these issues, working in close collaboration with key ministries, especially the DPMs, Nongovernmental organisations the Public Prosecutor's Office and the Judiciary. She said amongst other projects, through UNICEF, the US government has helped to establish Swaziland's first one-stop centre for survivors of abuse in Mbabane, while in Lubombo, they helped the establishment of a Child Friendly Court that we helped to set up is making it easier for child victims of abuse to bear witness in court proceedings in a child-friendly manner designed to minimise secondary trauma.

VIOLENCE CAN SCAR A CHILD FOR A LIFETIME — ODEDE

UNITED Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) Representative Rachel Odede says the organisation is concerned about violence against children because it has long term effects and can scar a child for a lifetime.

"Often it alters and damages a child's physical, emotional and mental development," she said. Odede said UNICEF is committed to ending abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence against children as stated on Sustainable Development Goal 16, target 16.2. She said in order to achieve SDG16, there is a need for the development of sustainable relevant child protection systems. She said availability of date and evidence is critical in this regard.

She further highlighted that research has proven that violence can contribute to economic losses, which can be as high as 2-8 per cent of the GDP and at the same time it can decrease the value of investments in child survival, development, education and pro-

tection.

"Violence against children is an issue that has become so important to our individual brands. It is universal, cuts across geographic, ethnic, religious, cultural and social economic boundaries. Bringing it to an end is a shared responsibility. Many victims of violence are too young or too vulnerable to protect themselves," said Odede. She further added that the report on "Drivers of violence against children in Swaziland" is a resourceful tool that will strengthen the prevention and response to violence initiatives. She said she hopes the report will assist stakeholders develop and implement interventions that are informed and guided by the study.

She said the absence of a legal framework that provides recourse to survivors of sexual violence remains a gap in addressing the social challenge in a comprehensive manner. She then urged the relevant actors to expeditiously pass the sexual offences and domestic Bill and have it enacted into a law.

REPORT TO PROVIDE FRESH DATA - PS MABUZA

DEPUTY Prime Minister's Office Principal Secretary Khangeziwe Mabuza said she hopes the national study on the drivers of violence against children in Swaziland will inform future programming for targeted response measures towards reducing the scourge of violence.

Mabuza is also the chairperson of the high level task force on violence (HLTFV). She described the report as qualitative in nature, as it will provide fresh data to inform programming, lobbying and advocacy as well as resource mobilisation initiatives.

She said the battle against violence in general is not over, despite the existing programmes within government, civil society and private sector organisations. "We still have much more to do to combat violence in society which includes violence against women (VAW), violence against children (VAC), violence against men (VAM)

as well as the intimate partner violence (IPV)," she said.

She further said there is need to conduct research on the drivers of violence in Swaziland that would capture the other manifestations of violence across ages.

She said there is also a need to strengthen the surveillance, case management and monitoring and evaluation systems to determine the extent of the interventions.

WEAKER EL NINO TO BE EXPERIENCED IN AUG

AFTER one of the most severe El Nino events on record, the models immediately turned around to a weakest El Nino situation thus far in 2017/18 period.

Up to August, 2017, the models were showing the weakest El Nino that will have not much impact compared to

the El Nino that affected the country the past season.

According to Swazi Meteorology Service Acting Director Jabulani Hlatjwako said the public assumed conditions associated with an El Nino are weather pattern associated with drought and water scarcity as seen recently in the country. However, he said this time around Swazis should not panic much since a weaker El Nino is likely to develop.

"The next summer season has increased the likelihood for the development of El Nino conditions which are however weaker compared to that of 2016," he said. Hlatjwako said they would make sure that they released monthly forecast updates on the El Nino situation. "We are currently at a warning stage, so the public should not worry much," he said.

The previous El Nino, which faded in May last year, brought widespread drought to the country, hitting crop production and fuelling inflation across the region while leaving millions in need of food aid. Ten southern Africa countries including Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe are at risk of the El Niño climate phenomenon.

NDMA's intervention strategy in place

THE National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) has established systems and mechanisms to ensure that there is smooth coordination of response interventions to avoid loss of life, livestock and food availability in the country.

This has been done to prepare for the same situation or worse (2015/2016 drought) that befell the country.

NDMA Chief Executive Officer Russell Dlamini said incase another severe El Nino developed in the coming season, the agency is ready to ensure that there is smooth coordination of response interventions to avoid loss of life, livestock and food availability in the country.

"However, this is all dependent on availability of resources and the rate of response from the donor community," said Dlamini.

Dlamini said in the year 2016, NDMA and partners had been able to initiate a number of water projects, which were not only going to deal with the drought on a short-term basis but also long term.

In the area of water security, a number of boreholes were drilled and operationalised including two high yielding boreholes in the Shiselweni region where water could be sourced and further distributed to nearby communities using water tanker trucks.

"In Mbabane Swaziland Waters Services Corporation (SWSC) capacity was aug-

mented through the harnessing of Pholinjane/Mbabane river which increased Mbabane supply by five megaliters per day," he said.

Also, there is Luphohlo Mbabane pipeline which is meant to ensure there is constant water supply in Mbabane even during a severe drought.

Meanwhile, from May 29, NDMA working with the deputy prime minister's office an annual assessment will be conducted by Swaziland Vulnerability Assessment Committee (Swazi VAC).

The assessment will provide an estimate of the number of people who will be in need of food support.

Dlamini further mentioned that all food distribution plans for 2016 were planned to end in April, 2017.

It is worth mentioning therefore that this gap has not only been driven by the shortage of resources but also planned to allow the community to consume what may have been harvested from the season. "It is not the NDMA's desire to perpetually give assistance thus creating dependence on aid. Our approach is that always interventions must be informed by evidence."

There is a document called the National Emergency Response, Mitigation and Adaptation Plan (NERMAP) that is meant to address issues of drought and food shortage. Therefore it is worth noting that this document has been very effective because it acted as a guide and plan for the entire response in 2016/17. "Issues of water shortage, food insecurity, were addressed following the same NERMAP document.

Having a plan is the first step of dealing with any problem, by saying so as a country we were better positioned to attract funding and also implement the different programmes through the NERMAP," he stated.

Abusive businessman sued for assault

A businessman's former girl friend is suing her former exlover to pay her after beating her senseless.

Bongani Mndzebele stands accused of assaulting his girlfriend Khetsiwe Mkhatjwa following suspicions she was cheating on him with his friends.

The two were in court for trial before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini and both detailed how the alleged assault unfolded at Pine Valley inside a house rented by Mndzebele. Mkhatjwa told the court that the alleged assailant

was renting the house for her after he moved her from another house he was renting at Nkwalini Zone Four (4).

Whilst being e m o t i o n a l, Mkhatjwa made it clear before court she did not want anything to do with Mndzebele anymore as she said he was abusive and controlling.

She alleged on April 4, Mndzebele came to their rented flat whilst she was in town and refused to pay rent. "I was called by the landlord to come to the house and I rushed back, indeed I found him there," she said.

She added the landlord excused them to sort out their issues but when they got inside the house she alleged Mndzebele accused her of cheating on him before assaulting her all over her body using open hands, fists, kicks and items such as a wooden spoon.

"He also used a toaster cable to assault me, and he kicked me when I fell down until I became weak and raised an alarm," she added.

She alleged she bled from the injuries on her head and body.

Mkhatjwa said her lung collapsed such that she could not be able to take her belongings when the businessman chased her out of the house.

"I managed to call the police and was taken to hospital. Now, my lung has been permanently damaged. I will never be like any other normal person anymore. I need him to pay for what he did

to me. I also want to teach him a lesson so that he does not do this to other women," she said.

The complainant was being led in her evidence inchief when she further said Mndzebele once took her to Nkomazi

where he assaulted her for allegedly cheating on him.

"This man is dangerous; he also did not allow me to have friends. He also blocked me from visiting home, he said I should stay indoors," she added.

She added she was no longer in love with him and that Mndzebele's friends had also warned her about seeing him as they allegedly insisted he was a dangerous man.

The matter was postponed to June 2 for continuation.

Drama as govt driver punches baby mama, cop in court

THE pressure of defaulting in child maintenance took a nasty twist when a government driver punched the mother of his child and a policeman at the magistrate's court on Wednesday.

Vusi Mtsetfwa reacted angrily when Crown Counsel Buddy Masango asked for his employment number to help the court finalise a garnishee order against him since he has been failing to pay money for child support for over a year now.

Mtsetfwa caused drama when he argued with Lungile Ndlovu, the mother of his child, before landing several punches on her face.

The argument was mainly caused by the employment number required by the Counsel.

Mtsetfwa further accused Ndlovu of having a love affair with Masango whilst they argued about his failure to support his child.

Mtsetfwa is employed as a driver at the ministry of economic planning and development.

The incident happened at Masango's

office, better known as the DPP's maintenance office at around 1200 hours in front of other maintenance applicants who were queuing for help.

The scuffle drew a number of people as the respondent's fist aimed at Masango's face missed the Crown's Counsel by a whisker.

However, Mtsetfwa turned to a policeman calming the situation down. He landed a stinging punch on the officer's face. The police officer then handcuffed him before calling for back up as Mtsetfwa proved to be violent.

When Mtsetfwa was handcuffed, he did the unthinkable as he smashed the handcuffs on the floor until they broke before fighting with the police who were trying to whisk him away from the crowded office.

This led to policemen finding yet another set of handcuffs before detaining him in one of the rooms in court. He was kept there for close to 30 minutes whilst a police van was orgainised to take him to the Mbabane Police Station.

During that time the officers were recording statements from the victim and eye witnesses.

According to police officers, who were guarding him, they alleged Mtsetfwa

was being violent as he did not want to be arrested.

"I was avoiding talking to him as I had been told he was targeting me.

He was aggressive but I told him we had nothing to talk about as he was failing to pay maintainance of his child. I then rushed inside the counsel's office after noticing he was getting more aggressive," Ndlovu said.

Shocked

Moreover, Masango said he was shocked by Mtsetfwa's reaction as he was only trying to calm him down after Ndlovu screamed for help. Mtsetfwa could not comment as he was detained by the police and their maintenance case had to be postponed.

According to reports from the police, the assailant was charged with two criminal counts of assault and he is expected to make a court appearance this week.

On another note, Mtsetfwa was in court after two women, his first wife and baby mama, dragged him there for failure to support his children.

The court had ordered him to fork out E350 on each child but due to defaulting, the arrears raised the amount of money he was forking out for each child


MAN ASSAULTED IN PUBLIC, COLLAPSES

Emergency services were notified about the assault by concerned members of the Pigg's Peak public who assumed that the victim was unconscious.

Concealed

A bystander said if the victim had not run out of the bar he would have lost his life as his attackers had concealed weapons.

At time time of compiling this report the victim was at the Pigg's Peak government hospital and his condition and name were yet to be ascertained.

Shoes and chains aid copper thieves

IT has been revealed that shoes and chains are used to aid copper wire thieves in northern Hhohho as they help themselves to copper.

Sources within the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) said northern Hhohho is becoming a haven for copper wire theft.

Speaking to this newspaper, a police source said thugs in Northern Hhohho particularly at Buhleni, Horo, and Herefords are now using old shoes tied in between chains to trip electric wires before cutting and stealing copper.

"People are going through very dangerous lengths to steal copper, we have seen a lot of thugs using old shoes tied in between chains. This is then thrown at the overhead electric lines causing them to touch thus overload the electric transformer which then turns off," said the police source.

Transformer

When the transformer is off this allowed the thugs to touch and cut the electric lines as there is no electricity running through them.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba said Northern Hhohho was not the only region that registered copper theft.

"The whole country is faced with copper theft problem, I can report that the actual number of thefts pertaining to the electric lines has in fact dwindled. This I feel is a very good sign and shows that we the police are working hard to put an end to this very dangerous and costly exercise," said Mamba.

"It's not the school which should take the blame but its high time government starts acting as there is need to have additional classrooms.


"Though it's not the only school around here, the good thing with it is that this ones is accessible as it is within town," one parent said.


Muntu Dlamini did not want to elaborate on the issue but hinted that Grade One space remained a challenge.

However, now allegations are that the person they appointed has been making money through his appointment, despite that he is also being paid for being a trustee, he is allegedly demanding money from some of the people coming to look for jobs.

The authorities had entrusted this individual with the responsibility of being the one approached when there are labourers needed



Already, the *umphakatsi* has received six cases where some of the residents have come out to claim that the person entrusted to be its eye and ear was applying dirty ways of making money which he demands from desperate job seek-

Evidence

An insider at the umphakatsi revealed that they were busy collecting evidence which would lead to action taken against the person who was entrusted to be the authority's representative.

"He is getting paid just to be umphakatsi's linkage and what is now worrying us are reports that he is swindling the same people who he should be assisting to get a jobs.

"His only task is to make sure resi-

dents chosen to be employed are known in the community.

"We want the truth about the allegations and if there is tangible evidence, we will be forced to rope-in the police," said one of the elders.

The elders at the umphakatsi are reportedly keen to know how much the man has collected from the residents and thst if it is discovered that he indeed took advantage of the situation, drastic actions would be taken against him.

"Should we find that he has been taking bribes, then we will refer this to the relevant bodies as we cannot allow someone to taint our image as umphakatsi. He has to clear himself on these rumours," said one of the elders.

Hlatikulu residents insist on board's commission of enquiry

HLATIKULU residents still expect Minister of Housing and Urban Development Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza to set-up a commission of inquiry into alleged irregularities within the town board.

Mahamba Gorge Hiking proceeds for the needy


ABOUT E130 000 of the proceeds from this year's Mahamba Gorge Hiking will be distributed amongst needy members of the community.

Could President Zuma be out by next week?

SOUTH AFRICA - President Jacob Zuma is at the weakest moment of his term as ANC leader.

Zuma can no longer count on his party's caucus in Parliament to save him from a humiliating motion of no confidence that threatens to cut short his scandalous reign.

The return of Brian Molefe to Eskom this week - seemingly with the support of Zuma and the Guptas - has pushed the ANC to the edge and there is renewed talk of recalling Zuma at next week's meeting of the national executive committee (NEC).

Senior ANC members believe the power has shifted sufficiently for Zuma to be recalled on the back of Molefe's return - the umptieth scandal of his presidency that many in the party now loudly believe will lead to electoral defeat for the ANC in 2019.

Molefe's return has pitted the ANC against Zuma and the Guptas. Many in the ANC now openly talk about the urgency to remove Zuma "to save what is left of South Africa".

The ANC has set the government, led

by Zuma, an ultimatum: rescind Molefe's appointment, or else. "Or else" seemingly means "we will get rid of you".

There is a growing belief in the ANC, even under staunch Zuma supporters who are thinking of their own political futures, that only a Cyril Ramaphosa presidency can save the ANC from electoral defeat in 2019.

There are also some who believe and openly state that even a Ramaphosa presidency will not save the ANC from collapse and that the party is already

Zuma's weakened power has no matter what. boosted Ramaphosa's campaign for ANC president and he is now openly campaigning in provinces like Mpumalanga, North West and KwaZulu-Natal that were until recently no-go zones for Zuma's foes.

Until recently it was unthinkable for an opposition motion of no confidence against Zuma to succeed in Parliament, but the caucus is divided on the matter and there is a strong push-back against the instruction from Luthuli House that they should toe the party line

The majority of ANC members still prefer the NEC to provide leadership on the matter and recall Zuma for bringing the party into disrepute, but there is a growing feeling under ANC MPs that the electorate and the ANC's founding values demand of them to do the right thing when a president is no longer fit to rule.

There is a growing sense in the ANC caucus that "if the NEC can no longer provide moral leadership, we should".



I couldn't believe we could be back to square one, discussing the very issue that divided this country barely three seasons ago.

In fact, I thought the idea of increasing teams or not relegating some teams, as it were, had been emphatically dealt with at the time.

Evidently, I was The difference this time is that wrong. I was Highlanders are not condemned yet as one of they still have a bit of a lifeline, that is, those if they beat hard-core rivals Mbabane who Swallows in the deciding match of the season. Herculean task indeed, given the stature of their opponents. But that's not the only obstacle in Highlanders' bid to evade the relegation humiliation as their fate now depends on how the other clubs perform. So, nothing has been decided yet. It's beneath my understanding how Gamedze, the very same person we all supported and defended as if our lives depended on it, can do this?

We all praised him for his boldness and bravery when he refused to be manipulated into increasing teams to save Highlanders only three years ago then the man summersaults in this man-

If that's what he stands for, then he's lost me as a supporter. I'm one of those who have supported Gamedze, the visionary leader and shcreued businessman he is but I cannot stand here and applaud his manipulative ways to change decisions as and when they suit him.

Agree

If he can agree to the move now it makes me wonder why he didn't agree to it three years ago? Then, the PLS chairman was armed with 11 strong reasons why it would be wrong to increase

These things have a way of coming back to haunt you as a person. What Gamedze has done with this decision to save Highlanders - is to destroy the legacy he has created in the Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) in one moment of absurdity.

Harshly

Furthermore, Gamedze and his cohorts must know that history will judge them harshly for the decision that buried Swazi football alive.

NO matter how much we aspire to be like Jesus Christ it will not happen for as long as we are not the chosen ones like he was to pursue and complete the difficult task of the trials he was subjected to and the crucifixion.

But maybe for Zimbabwean Pastor Jonathan Mthethwa this was possible by provoking the appetite of crocodiles when he attempted to walk on the water of the river in the majestic swagger of Christ.

Three crocodiles devoured his body completely living only his underwear and sandals, the Daily Mail reported in Harare on Monday.

But it was the miracle of Jesus walking on the water that, more than any other, convinced Jesus' disciples that He was indeed the Son of God (Matthew 14:32-33). The story unfolds at the Sea of Galilee, which lies in the lower portion of the Jordan Valley in a mountain range that rises to 1 300 metres above sea level. The lake itself is 700 feet below the Mediterranean Sea. One of the more noteworthy aspects of this body of water is that it is greatly susceptible to sudden and extremely violent storms.

These storms are caused by the cold air rushing down from the mountains surrounding it and colliding with the warm, moist air rising off the surface of the water itself.

"When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, where they got into a boat and set off across the lake for Capernaum. By now it was dark, and Jesus had not yet joined them.

Approaching

A strong wind was blowing and the waters grew rough. When they had rowed three or three and a half miles, they saw Jesus approaching the boat, walking on the water; and they were terrified. But he said to them, 'It is I; don't be afraid.' Then they were willing to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the shore where they were heading" (John 6:16-21).

These are accounts of the journalists who reported on the New Testament but as for Pastor Mthethwa we were told the Crocodile River did not succumb to calm to his stead as the Sea of Galilee did to Jesus but the permanent hosts, three crocodiles, simply devoured him and they were through in a couple of minutes.





This socialisation is the result of the decades of inequality women have been subject too, as narcissism is part of the struggle for social survival against self-doubt and the sense of inferiority. Computer game helps children make healthy food choices

LONDON - The seven-minute computer game involves children reacting to images of healthy food by pressing a button or doing nothing if unhealthy food are shown.

Researchers conducted two experiments on more than 200 children age four to 11 who played the computer game. For each image, a happy cartoon face was displayed for healthy food and a sad cartoon face was displayed for unhealthy food. Children were instructed to hit the space bar when they saw a happy face and do nothing if they saw a sad face. The children then played a shopping game where they were asked to choose a limited number of food items

SNPF now worth over E3.2bn

THOUGH the Swaziland National Provident Fund (SNPF) started with as little as E100 000 in 1976, today the fund is worth over E3.2 billion.

It was already worth E300 million by the year 2000.

This was disclosed by SNPF Chief Executive Officer Prince Lonkhokhela yesterday during the fund's inaugural annual stakeholder meeting held at Esibayeni Lodge in Matsapha yesterday.

The objectives of the annual stakeholder forum which was graced by Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula were to share information on the operations of the fund in an open, effective and timely manner and to create opportunity for stakeholders to interact with the board and management and share their thoughts on the operations of the fund.

Dlamini said to date the fund had over 5 000 registered companies with over 120 000 workers.

"We paid benefits worth over E120 million in the past year," he said.

Dlamini said this showed that the fund was still at a very healthy level.

"We have never at any point in time felt shy about the performance of the fund. We are still proud of it and we are optimistic going forward that we will remain proud of it," he said.

Adding, he said they had managed to pay an interest level above five per cent to members reaching 10 per cent at times.

Dlamini said fund has also positioned itself to invest 50 per cent in the local economy as stipulated by the regulator, the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA).

He said this was critical as offshore investments only benefit foreign economies.

"Fortunately, when the SNPF was formed it was barred from investing outside the local economy until 1995. True, the returns in the local economy were minimal, when the Johannesburg Stock Exchange (JSE) started growing, we jumped in. However, FSRA came in. The reason we are not against this development is that if we cannot take the risk of investing in our own country, who then can take that risk?"

Some of the SNPF investments include the Happy Valley Hotel in Ezulwini, the E700 million Lower Maguduza Hydro-Power project which SNPF jointly implements with Old Mutual and the Public Service Pensions Fund (PSPF) and the E90 million dairy project where SNPF also partnered with the Public Service Pensions Fund (PSPF) and Old Mutual Swaziland.

Dlamini said under the dairy project they intended to buy a total herd of 3 000 milking cows and produce at least 60 per cent of milk needed by the country. He said they were currently preparing for the launch of the dairy project. "What is important for us is to create jobs and grow the local economy," he said.

SwaziBank pays E2.5m dividend to government

SWAZIBANK paid a E2.5 million dividend to government during the past financial year.

The bank made a profit worth E20.7 million during the past financial year ended March 31, 2017.

Speaking during the official opening of the bank's new Siteki branch, Minister of Finance Martin Dlamini applauded the financial institution for remaining profitable.

He also commended the bank for being self sustainable since its restructuring without government assistance.

"Since the last capitalisation and restructuring in 2001, the bank has been able to sustain itself and not rely on government subvention or assistance. The bank is also able to source its own funding through deposits and loans," he said.

MOBILE MONEY TAX PAYMENT 2ND PHASE TO INCLUDE IMPORT VAT

THE second phase of Mobile Money tax payment mode will cover customs duties and import Value Added Tax (VAT).

The first phase of the project included Company Tax, Provisional Tax, Pay as You Earn (PAYE), Domestic Value Added Tax, Withholding Tax, Sales Tax, Casino Levy and Fuel Tax

Speaking during the launch of the Mobile Money tax payment mode held on Wednesday at the Royal Swazi Sun Convention Centre in Ezulwini, Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) Commissioner General Dumisani Masilela disclosed that they would continue their engagements with Swazi MTN to implement phase two of the project which would cover amongst others; payment of goods imported into the country which was Customs Duties and import VAT.

He said the authority has made huge strides with regards to the modernisations of tax payments.

"Starting way back in 2011, when we took over the revenue administration function from the government, the level of tax compliance was generally low. This was confirmed by an International Monetary Fund (IMF) report compiled in 2007 which concluded that paying taxes was optional in Swaziland," he said.

In tax administration, compliance is defined in many different ways. Masilela said the main elements that they track were registration compliance, filing compliance and payment compliance.

He said whilst an effort was made by the then tax administration to introduce electronic platforms to facilitate tax-payment, they realised that they still had a long way to go.

"At the time tax payments were essentially done in cash or cheques at the different tax offices which existed at the time.

"In line with our vision, we took a deliberate decision to modernise our

work and in partnership with all banking institutions in the country, we tapped into their electronic platforms," he said.

After engagements with the institutions, Masilela said in 2013 they introduced a new and simpler method of making and referencing tax payments.

"This included payment at the banking halls, internet banking and transfers inside the banks. We later installed Point of Service gadgets (Speed Points) in all our major service centres and border posts. This allowed us to facilitate payment while minimising the risk of carrying cash on the part of the taxpayer and keeping large amounts of cash on the part of our officers," he said

Masilela dearly thanked the banks for continuing to look at other ways to help improve payment compliance especially through their digital platforms.

"We would like to make it clear that as the SRA, we stand ready to partner with any service provider that will assist us make compliance easier for our clients," he said.

Eskom claims it didn't pay Gupta-linked Trillian a cent

CAPE TOWN – Eskom yesterday denied paying Gupta-linked Trillian in 2016, after a report alleged payments to the firm were used by Gupta-owned Tegeta to buy Optimum coal mine for R2.15bn.

Eskom spokesperson Khulu Phasiwe told Fin24 yesterday that while Trillian was listed as a supplier of Eskom in 2016, the power utility has no record of paying any money as no services were used.

As part of a series by amaBhungane, the investigative unit is digging deeper into the basis of the public protector's State of Capture report in 2016, providing new allegations that – if found to be true – could connect the dots to prove that the state (through Eskom executives or government offi-

cials) and the Guptas conspired to take over Optimum from Glencore.

On Monday, amaBhungane revealed how former mining minister Ngoako Ramatlhodi claimed Eskom CEO Brian Molefe and Chairperson Ben Ngubane pressured him to help the Guptas take over Glencore's coal mine in 2016.

Their latest expose claims that Public Enterprises Minister Lynne Brown misled Parliament in December 2016 by stating that no contracts had been concluded between Trillian and Eskom


The report says Trillian, which is owned by Gupta associate Salim Essa (who has a 21.5 per cent stake in Tegeta), invoiced Eskom for R266m at the time of Brown's submission and then invoiced it for a further R153m after the submission.

This links to the allegation that Trillian helped the Guptas pay for Optimum coal mine, after they were allegedly short of cash to buy the mine.

The State of Capture report states that Trillian "contributed to the purchase price of OCH (Optimum)", adding that Trillian and its subsidiaries put R235.4m into a Tegeta account in the Bank of Beroda, which was then used for the purchase. Trillian denies this occurred.

"AmaBhungane has confirmed that Trillian companies invoiced Eskom a total of about R419m between April and December 2016," it reported yesterday, listing the following, which allegedly occurred during Eskom CEO Brian Molefe's time.

20 BLACK ABSA CAPITAL STAFF STAGE WALKOUT


JOHANNESBURG - Black professionals at ABSA Capital on Tuesday staged a walkout after a top black manager was passed over for the position of head of corporate and investment banking, according to a source close to the company.

The source said that about 20 black employees had got up and left during the announcement of leadership changes at ABSA Capital headquarters in Sandton.

"The announcement made yesterday which was interpreted as Phakamani [Hadebe] didn't get the nod – which shocked a lot of people – hence the anger and the walkout at the staff meeting by black employees," the source said.

Khaya Sithole, a former KwaZulu-Natal chairperson of the Association for the Advancement of Black Accountants in Southern Africa, said on his Twitter page today: "Rumour has it Phakamani Hadebe has been exiled from ABSA and the clever blacks have finally grown a pair and staged a walkout. Anyone know?"

"The bank's record on transformation is not rosy and the argument that there are not capable and sufficiently experienced black professionals just doesn't wash any more after top black manager overlooked



when things like this happen," the source close to ABSA said.

"It is the first time in my career, I have seen black professionals actually openly display their level of displeasure in this manner. Black people behaved like the Economic Freedom Fighters and walked out," the source said.

"People are fed up. Things are going to reach a tipping point – we can't continue like this," the source claimed.

David Hodnett, Barclays Africa Deputy Chief Executive and Chief Executive of the group's South African banking operations, said in an internal note to ABSA staff on Tuesday morning, which City Press has seen, that Hadebe, Head of Client at ABSA Corporate and Investment Banking, had decided to leave the bank for "personal reasons".


The matter of Hadebe's departure was the first point raised in Hodnett's note.

General Motors exits SA - Isuzu to step in

PORT ELIZABETH - American automotive giant General Motors has announced that it is withdrawing from the South African market. As a result, production and sales of Chevrolet models will cease and Isuzu will take control of the firm's Port Elizabeth operations.

This major announcement was made to the press early on May 18 2017 in Port Elizabeth, after GM's top management had informed its workforce and dealers of the decision. When the process is concluded by year-end (as planned), it will



mark the end of the US multinational's 13-year tenure in South Africa, which saw the introduction of the Chevrolet, Hummer and Cadillac brands as well as the production of Isuzu and a number of Opel and Chevrolet products.

Speaking to Cars.co.za exclusively

prior to the announcement, Ian Nicholls, President and MD of General Motors South Africa, said: "General Motors is today announcing restructuring actions in a number of different markets to drive stronger global financial performance."

"From a global point of view, the firm is adopting a more efficient structure to allow it to focus on its core business of building and selling vehicles and also investing heavily in defining the future of personal mobility."

EU launches 'Dieselgate' case against Italy

BRUSSELS - The EU launched infringement proceedings against Italy on Wednesday for failing to adequately investigate emissions cheating allegations against automaker Fiat.

The accusations involving the Italian auto giant come in the wake of the Volkswagen "dieselgate" scandal, revealed in 2015, that affected 11 million cars.

The European Commission, the EU's executive arm, says Italian authorities ignored the presence of so called "defeat devices" in Fiat autos that enable cars to minimise pollution levels during tests.

Italy follows Germany, Britain and five other member states challenged by the commission in December for turning a blind eye to emissions cheating.

"The commission decided today to send a letter of formal notice asking Italy to respond to concerns about insufficient action taken regarding the emission control strategies employed by Fiat Chrysler Automobiles group (FCA)," a statement said.

The notice is the first step in the EU's infringement procedure that ensures the bloc's 28 member states abide by EU-wide regulations.

Ahead of the widely expected decision, Italian Transport Minister Graziano Delrio said he found the action "particularly disappointing."

Delrio firmly denied that any cheating by Fiat took place and maintained that his services could provide evidence to clear Italy of any wrongdoing.

Under current EU law, infringement proceedings remain the commission's only tool to fight auto makers in the wake of the scandal.

Day-to-day regulation of the auto sector, including approving new car models for the road, remains under the authority of national governments.

Last year, the commission proposed an overhaul of rules on how vehicles are licensed and tested across the EU, but has faced resistance from member states and European Parliament.

IEZA'S APPLICATION TO INT **ALULA STRUCK OFF T**

PRETORIA - Former Hawks boss Major-General Berning Ntlemeza's application to interdict Police Minister Fikile Mbalula has been struck off the roll by the North Gauteng High Court in Pretoria.

Judge Sheila Mphahlele struck Ntlemeza's urgent application to interdict Mbalula off the roll and has awarded costs to Mbalula.

Ntlemeza's lawyers on Wednesday argued that his application to interdict Mbalula was urgent, as the minister's actions were illegal and prevented Ntlemeza from returning to his duties.

Nazeer Cassim, for Mbalula, argued that a full bench had found

that Ntlemeza was not fit to hold office, that this application was not urgent, and was tantamount to scoring political points.

Advocate Nceba Duduka argued that the interdict sought to stop Mbalula acting illegally.


Judge Mphahlele told Duduka that he needed to convince her that the application was urgent, seeing as Ntlemeza's enforcement order appeal would be heard in front of the Supreme Court of Appeal on June 2. Duduka argued that every day that Ntlemeza did not report for duty was another day that he was prejudiced and humiliated.

In March, the court found that then-police minister Nathi Nhleko had ignored two court judgments, which found that Ntlemeza lacked integrity and honesty when he appointed him head of the elite police unit.

The court found that the findings in both judgments constituted "direct evidence" that Ntlemeza lacked the requisite honesty, integrity and conscientiousness to hold public office, effectively setting aside his appointment.

Ntlemeza applied for leave to appeal these findings, but was unsuccessful. However, he was granted leave to appeal an enforcement order which stopped him from going to work.

'ANC MPs voting againts Zuma would be worst betrayal'

JOHANNESBURG - The craft," Khoza's post read. ANC has sent its strongest warning yet that it will not tolerate dissent in the motion of no confidence vote against President Jacob Zuma.

ANC secretary General Gwede Mantashe said if ANC MPs supported the motion brought forward by the Democratic Alliance and supported by other opposition parties, "it would be the highest betrayal"

Some ANC MPs have also begun speaking out, signalling that they would follow their conscience rather than the party

ANC MP Dr Makhosi Khoza said on her Facebook page that she will always vote for the ANC's survival, but not for an "amoral leader".

"I therefore cannot be expected to vote [for] an amoral leader whose behavioural practices liquidates the ANC at a speed faster than the space-

Opposition parties that are a minority in Parliament have also claimed that they have spoken to enough ANC MPs to ensure the success of the motion.

Debate

"That will be the worst day of my life when ANC members follow the command of the opposition," Mantashe said.

He said ANC members that defy the party line lack "organisational discipline".

"The most important characteristic of organisational discipline, is the ability to suppress your emotional feeling, if you can't suppress your emotional feeling, we can't talk organisational discipline of any sorts," Mantashe said.

He added that there is always space to fight for Zuma to go within the ANC.

The party is due to hold its National Executive Committee meeting next week, at which the motion is expected to be debated.

It will be the first NEC since Zuma's Cabinet reshuffle that saw five ministers lose their positions, including former finance minister Pravin Gordhan, who was replaced by Malusi Gigaba.

Mantashe and his deputy Jessie Duarte have already descended on the ANC caucus to warn MPs to follow the party line and vote against the

JOHANNESBURG - Presidential hopeful Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma wants ANC members to stop singing songs about guns".

at ANC members who use violence and kill their comrades over posi-

"In this province, especially, where does this come from? And why, when it is done, no one is arrested, even when women are fair game and they are killed? No, comrades, councillorship is a responsibility given to you by the ANC," she said.

"It's important, comrades, that we don't kill each other for positions,"

Dlamini-Zuma said councillors only stay for five years, and would only be redeployed when they did well.

Breaking away from this theme, she repeated her campaign mantra that the ANC was advocating for radical economic transformation to better black people's lives.

She said land should be used as surety to better black people's financial circumstances, which is why it needed to be urgently addressed.

Holomisa undermined Trollip for removing Bobani from the Mayoral Committee team and basically accused him of making a decision without consensus.





'ISLAMISTS' STONE COUPLE TO DEATH IN NORTH MALI - OFFICIAL

BAMAKO-An unmarried couple was stoned to death in public in northeast Mali by "Islamists", local officials told AFP on Wednesday, the first such incident since jihadist groups were driven out of the region.

Jihadists seized key northem cities in Mali in March 2012, and though they were driven out by a Frenchled military intervention in 2013, Islamist groups continue to make their presence felt with frequent attacks on domestic and foreign forces.

"The Islamists dug two holes where they put the man and the woman who lived maritally without being married," said a local official. "They were stoned to death."

Stones
The stoning happened in Taghlit on Tuesday, close to Aguelhok in the Kidal region, and the same source told AFP that members of the public were invited to take part.

"Four people threw stones at them until they died," they said.

Another local official said the Islamists had accused the unmarried couple of violating "Islamic law", which requires punishment by stoning.

During their brief control of key towns in the vast north, jihadist groups imposed a version of Sharia law which forced women to wear veils and set whipping and stoning as punishment for transgressions. In July 2012, the Al-Qaeda-linked Ansar Dine group stoned a couple in public in Aguelhok who they accused of having children outside marriage.

The stoning comes on the eve of an expected visit to Mali by French President Emmanuel Macron, who is due to meet French troops stationed there soon.

The Malian Association for the Defence of Human Rights (AMDH)

described the stoning as "cowardly murder".

"This is barbaric. The people who did this should be arrested and put on trial," said Oumar Diakite, an AMDH official. A 2015 peace deal signed by Tuareg-led rebels, the government and pro-Bamako militias aimed to quell separatist uprisings in the north and isolate jihadist groups.

But its implementation has been piecemeal and the jihadists, who did not sign up to the accord, continue to mount attacks on civilians and the army, as well as French and UN forces. The new UN peacekeeping chief said a rapid intervention force of Senegalese troops would soon be deployed in central Mali, which has seen an increase in attacks and communal violence since 2015. Jean-Pierre Lacroix, on his first visit to Mali since becoming under secretary-general for UN peacekeeping operations, said the UN mission lacked capacity.

'Excessive' spending by Zim government could fuel inflation

HARARE - The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is warning that excessive spending by President Robert Mugabe's government will worsen cash shortages and stoke inflation.

The warning came as latest figures showed inflation rose to 0.48 per cent in April up from 0.21 per cent in March.

"Excessive government spending, if continued, could exacerbate the cash scarcity, further jeopardise the health of the external and financial sectors, and, ultimately, fuel inflation," said Ana Lucia Coronel, who

headed an IMF mission to the country this month.

Hyper-inflation peaked in Zimbabwe in 2008. The government was forced to abandon the Zimbabwe dollar in early 2009. But high domestic borrowing and lack of financial inflows has seen foreign currency and the recently-introduced bond notes running short.

In her statement issued late on Monday, the IMF's Coronel urged the government to "unleash the potential of the private sector" and "demonstrate that Zimbabwe is open for business".

"This will include enhancing efforts to tackle corruption, encouraging private sector investment, allowing the market to determine prices, promoting labour flexibility, and creating a stable legal and regulatory framework to reduce policy uncertainty," she added.

Meantime, the Confederation of Zimbabwe Industries (CZI) wants Mugabe's government to make it compulsory for wages and prices to be denominated in rand, to encourage wider use of the South African currency.

ABUJA - Nigeria's government on Wednesday said another Chibok girl was free, having escaped from Boko Haram Islamists more than three years after she was kidnapped with more than 200 classmates.

Presidency spokesperson Femi Adesina said Vice President Yemi Osinbajo informed ministers at a Cabinet meeting.

She was "found by the Nigerian troops while she was escaping", added government aide Bashir Ahmad. *AP*

Rebel chief escapes in DRC prison break

KINSHASA - Rebels from an outlawed political-religious group attacked Kinshasa's central prison on Wednesday, breaking out their leader and about 50 other prisoners, the Congolese government said. "Followers of the Bundu Dia Kongo (BDK) attacked Makala prison at dawn and broke out around 50 prisoners including their guru, Ne Muanda Nsemi," government spokesman Lambert Mende said, indicating that police had given chase.



IMMIGRANT ARRESTS SOAR UNDER TRUMP, FEWER DEPORTED

SANTA ANA - Immigration arrests increased by nearly 40 per cent in early 2017 as newly emboldened agents under US President Donald Trump detained more than 40 000 people suspected of being in the country illegally with a renewed focus on immigrants without criminal convictions.

The numbers released by Acting Immigration and Customs **Enforcement Director Thomas** Homan provide a snapshot of how the new president is carrying through on his campaign promises to make immigration enforcement a top pri-

Overall, 41 300 people were arrested for deportation. Nearly 11 000 had no criminal conviction, more than double the number of immigrants without criminal convictions arrested during a comparable period in 2016.

Even so, deportations carried out were down from late January to late

April compared to a year ago despite the new president's stepped up immigration enforcement effort.

The increase in arrests of people without criminal convictions has generated outrage across the US from Trump opponents who believe otherwise law-abiding families are being rounded up.

The report was made public as the Trump administration seeks to promote its accomplishments despite a growing scandal over the firing of the FBI director and the sharing of intelligence with Russian offi-

The president "puts this out to distract from the real affairs of our

country", said Angelica Salas, Executive Director of the Coalition for Humane Immigrant Rights. "It is unfortunate that he basically is using the pain and destroying our families as a way by which to give red meat to his base."

Some highlights in the numbers

 41 300 immigrants were arrested on suspicion of being in the country illegally between January 22 and April 29, up from 30 000 during a similar year-earlier period.

● 30 500 of those arrested had criminal convictions, compared to 25 800 for the earlier period.

 10 800 did not have criminal convictions, compared to 4 200 in the previous period.

Immigration enforcement operations have generated headlines nationwide since Trump signed an executive order on January 25. Many of them targeted violent offenders with felony records on crimes ranging from assault to murder.

UK PM to promise immigration curb

LONDON - British Prime Minister Theresa May has promised to crack down on immigration from outside the European Union as she unveils the Conservative Party's manifesto, the BBC reported.

May promised to "bear down on immigration from outside the EU" by asking firms to pay more to hire migrant workers.

The prime minister is expected to announce extra costs for employers choosing to hire non-EU workers for skilled jobs by doubling the skills charge.


Under the current scheme, small companies pay £364 (R6 207) a year in skills charge, while medium to large ones pays up to £ 1

Migrant workers will also be asked to pay more to use the National Health Service, according to the BBC.

The revenue generated will fund skills training for British work-

May is hoping the new measures will curb immigration from outside the EU to the tens of thousands a year, a pledge the Conservatives have made and failed at for the past seven years.

In the year to September 2016, immigration to the UK was estimated to be 596 000, of which 257 000 were non-EU citizens according to the official statistics agency. Daily Mail

Mexico's president calls for more protection of journalists

MEXICO CITY - Mexico's president says he's taking actions to halt slayings of journalists, though he hasn't given specifics.

President Enrique Pena Nieto did not take questions at a Wednesday event called "actions for freedom of expression and protection of journalists and defenders". He requested a moment of silence for those killed.

Pena Nieto was flanked by his security Cabinet and governors as he promised more resources to help journalists under threat and for the special prosecutor's office tasked with investigating such crimes. Past measures have been ineffective in stopping bloodshed among the country's media workers.

The slaying Monday of journalist Javier Valdez in Sinaloa state was the sixth in 2017.

Pena Nieto also called generally for better coordination between federal and state authorities.

US wants to end violence in Venezuela

UNITED NATIONS - US Ambassador Nikki Haley says the US has called for the first-ever Security Council consultations on Venezuela to seek joint efforts to ensure that President Nicolas Maduro ends violence and restores democracy. She said in a statement ahead of Wednesday's closed-door meeting that Venezuela is "on the verge of humanitarian crisis", with medicine unavailable, hospitals lacking supplies and people facing difficulty finding food. Haley said "peaceful protesters have been injured arrested and even killed by their own government"

White House knew about Flynn

WASHINGTON - Mike Flynn, Donald Trump's fired national security adviser, told the president-elect's transition team that he was the subject of a federal investigation, but was hired for the post anyway, the New York Times reported late Wednesday. The daily citing two people familiar with the case, said Flynn told the presidential transition team's chief lawyer Don McGahn about the investigation on January 4 -- weeks before assuming the highly sensitive post.Flynn, who ended up being fired from the position after just 24 days is at the centre of a sprawling federal investigation into alleged Russian interference in the 2016 US presidential election. AFP

PM accepts new finance crisis

PRAGUE - Czech Prime Minister Bohuslav Sobotka said on Wednesday he would accept a new finance minister to replace controversial billionaire Andrej Babis, ending a chaotic political crisis that risked bring down his government. The leftist Sobotka moved to sack his centrist arch-rival earlier this month after Babis came under heavy fire for alleged tax evasion and embarrassing leaked conversations. The tycoon, who ranks as the second wealthiest Czech national, has denied doing anything illegal but nonetheless agreed to leave amid mounting public pressure.

India to build nuclear power reactors

NEW DELHI - India on Wednesday said it will develop 10 domestically-built heavy water reactors to increase its nuclear power capacity. as it looks to ramp up clean energy generation. The federal Cabinet headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi approved the plan to build the pressurised heavy water reactors with a combined capacity of 7 000 megawatts, more than double the country's current atomic power generation of 6 780 megawatts. "A total of 7 000 MW capacity will be added. It will help produce clean energy," Power Minister Piyush Goyal said at a media briefing. AFP

Iran's top leader urges support

TEHRAN - Iran's supreme leader called on Wednesday for a high turnout in this week's presidential election, urging voters to head to the polls and send a message to the US - but stopped short of saying which candidate he prefers of the four remaining in the race. In a televised speech, Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei said the US and its allies. including the "pathetic prime minister of the Zionist regime", or Israel, are closely watching the voting today. He called the election a "great popular epic", saying that while the region is "drowned in anxiety", Iran is "peacefully and safely holding an election".

CAPE TOWN - Eric Tinkler says his Cape Town City perhaps got more than they deserved after a 1-0 home win over Lamontville Golden Arrows in the Absa Premiership on Wednesday kept alive their hopes of finishing second in the league this season.

Both sides squandered numerous opportunities in an entertaining game at the Athlone Stadium, before Musa Bilankulu turned the ball into his own net from an Aubrey Ngoma cross in the final minute of injury-time at the end of the game.

"It was a game of two halves and first half we weren't very good at all," Tinkler says. "Defensively we were poor, Arrows were trying to force us to play through the middle and we fell for it every single time. That allowed them to play off our mistakes.

"Their transitional play and counterattack is their main threat, they are not a team that will look to press you high up the field.

Mistake

They will look to drop off into the middle third and wait for you to make a mistake and capitalise on that.

"In the first half our shape was poor, we made the wrong decisions and we got away with it a bit."

But Tinkler says they made some

adjustments at the break and the introduction of midfielder Thabo Nodada also provided a boost for City.

"We rectified that at halftime and the players responded much better. When Thabo Nodada came in, the impetus really fell to our side, he made a big difference.

"We seemed to get a second wind, drive forward more and create a lot of chances. Their keeper [Nkosi Gumede] I think probably had his best game this season, he made some fantastic saves."

MM: In years gone by Highlanders were the most feared team in the country taking trophies left, right and centre of late the direct opposite of that is happening, where do you think we lost it?

ZJ: We did not transform our managerial

MM: A Few seasons ago Mbabane High-landers had a sole director who was working based on a contract. In vour assessment is the sole directorship working for Highlanders? If not what are the challenges in that? ZJ: Sole directorship has its own challenges,

MM: You and your team in the leadership structure took over the reign after supporters threatened former director Bheki Simelane and pushed him to resign, how was the state of the team when you took over and what were the main challenges you faced?

ZJ: Challenges were that players were given fraudulent and inflated contracts which means we started off from a conflict with the players. We found out that some of the players were not of the required premier league status and we found it difficult to find quality players over the short window period

MM: what does PLS vision 2022 mean to Highlanders?

Z.J: In 2015, The Premier League of Swaziland summoned Mbabane Highlanders, Manzini Wanderer, and Mbabane Swallows to a meeting at Lugogo Sun.

At this meeting they presented vision 2022 to us and informed us on the role they wanted us to play reaching that vision. We embraced that vision and therefore we have been supportive of the PLS on that vision.

That vision requires the three teams to work together in establishing a base for the success of the vision.

> It was during this meeting that it was discussed that amongst the other issues that we have to do as

the three teams was to established a common marketing strategy, a financial

model that will sustain the premier league. It is in the con-

text of this agreement that both Mba-bane Highlanders and Manzini Wan-der-

ers have received financial assistance from the premier league because we are integral to vision 2022

MM: Going forward, can you share some

light on future plans on reviving the team?

ZJ: We are in negotiations with some sponsors to enable us to buy some quality players and improve player welfare as well as improve our technical bench. We then want to commence the implementation to strategies that were agreed upon with PLS in terms of vision

MM: we have read in the media about PLS s moves to ban elders and patrons in team's structures. Can you shed some light on that issue? What is highlander's official stand on that?

ZJ: The PLS has not banned Patrons but has required that decision making in a club should be done by the directors. The patrons will continue to exist as an informal body to be consulted as and when necessary but will not be involved in decision making.

MM: There is a burning issue being discussed in harsh tones in the corridors of football about increasing teams to 14.

Most people believe it is being done to save Mbabane highlanders, yet a honest fact is that Mbabane highlanders has not been relegated, what can you tell supporters on this issue?


ZJ: You are correct that we haven't been relegated our obligation is to beat Mbabane Swallows when we meet them in order to avoid relegation. We are working towards

ZJ: My message to the team's supporters is that we support our leaders and stand united so that we can revive the Highlanders brand and take it to where it belongs.

The second match of the day pits Raiders against Imbumbe. Both teams suffered losses in their last outings despite displaying great performances.



At 1pm, Dunkylaine will take on table-toppers Steels.


Steels are currently at the summit of the log standings with the newly promoted Dunkylaine occupying the second spot from the bottom.

Chiyangwa says Swaziland not fit to host COSAFA

SOCCER - IT seems Swazis can forget about hosting the Council of Southern African Football Associations (COSAFA) Cup, if President Phillip Chiyangwa's sentiments are anything to go by.

From what COSAFA President Phillip Chiyangwa is saying, the COSAFA currently does not view smaller countries among its 14 member nations - Madagascar, Comoros and perhaps even Swaziland and Malawi as worthy or capable of hosting their headline competition.

In an article published in the Times Live, the president minced no words when questioned as to why the tournament is being rotated amongst the same countries ever since its inception, stating that countries like Swaziland among others did not have the proper infrastructure to host the tournament.

Bidding

"All the tournaments you see are awarded based on countries bidding, that they want to participate in this. You can't just be given a competition when you don't even have a stadium. Remember, people must go to a country where they have to stay nicely and so forth, and all those are considerations before being granted the opportunity host a competition."

The president's assessment that smaller countries in the region could successfully host the tournament has been viewed as off beam by most; especially because much of these countries' economies are tourism based (Mauritius and Seychelles just to name a few). When further quizzed on why SA keeps on hosting the tournament every two or three years, the president was imprecise, and stated that sponsorships played a role.

"COSAFA does not just operate on its own, or make a decision on its own," the president said.

Marketing

"We've got a company that is contracted to carry out marketing and sponsorship bills. It is paid as a commission for that. That's the company that comes back to us and says, 'That client of ours is still keen to carry on'. So we have to work on making the sponsor happy, because if for instance, if there is no sponsor, what would we do then?"

Meanwhile, when FA CEO Frederick Mngomezulu was contacted for a comment, he was reluctant on commenting stating that he hadn't seen Chiyangwa's comments.

"Problem is I haven't heard the comments, but I think it's something we need to look into because you may find that there are valid points that the president is making. The decision on who hosts a tournament is taken by COSAFA, after their evaluations," he said.
