MTN Swaziland beats 22 countries to win E1.3m

MTN Swaziland scooped E1.3 million in prize money and a trophy for being overall winners of this year's Group President and CEO Award in the 21 Days of Y'ello Care initia-

The local mobile network operator which is part of the giant mobile network operator, MTN Group, beat 22 countries to scoop this much sought after annual prize which comes with the \$100 000 cheque which is ploughed back to the social responsibility projecst initiated by the respective winners.

In a press statement released by the MTN Group Corporate Affairs office, Swaziland beat all the 22 countries to walk away with the award. MTN Swaziland was followed by MTN Sudan who received the Vice President Award for the MENA region.

DAGGA TO PUMP IN E23BN IF LEGALISEI

SWAZILAND is currently sitting on a potential to make E23.4 billion (US\$1.63 billion) in a year if it legalises cannabis.

This is a finding of Members of Parliament (MPs) that were tasked with the job of investigating the benefits the country could reap if it granted licences to people for cannabis cultivation.

The money that could be potentially made by Swaziland from cannabis could be 26 times more than what sugar production brings, which is the country's major cash crop.

The gross domestic product (GDP) for the country could triple because of cannabis. All these facts are contained in a report compiled by the select committee. The report is yet to be debated for adoption by Parliament.

The MPs that formed part of the committee included Saladin Magagula (Hhukwini), Njabulo Mabuza (Kubuta), Joseph Souza (Lugongolweni), Gideon Dlamini (Mkhiweni), and Sikhumbuzo Dlamini (Nkwene).

The report was tabled before the House of Assembly on Wednesday by MP Saladin Magagula, who is the Chairperson of the committee. The committee is of the view that the cannabis industry is lucrative and has high potential to boost the economy.

The MPs have further stated that cannabis could go a long way in solving problems of unemployment and poverty alleviation. Currently, 53 per cent of the country's youth is unemployed and 70 per cent of the country's population is made up of the youth.

The legislators are warning the country against possible regrets in this regard.

Cannabis better than alcohol

CANNABIS is said to be far better than alcohol, but the puzzling fact is that the latter is legal, while the former remains illegal.

They are worried about the possibilities of this market being saturated as some countries, according to them, are seen to be moving towards this direction in a trendy way.

The country is lagging behind in that regard. Countries like Lesotho are said to be ahead of this country in that regard and 37 other countries have legalised and still increasing. Lesotho is said to have already injected E30 million in the first phase of Lesotho dagga industry.

In other countries, it is reported that medical oils range from US\$20 to US\$60 (E270 to E810) per gram.

Some stakeholders who submitted during the investigations, according to the report, are also of the view that cannabis should be legalised. They even mentioned that Swaziland was at an advantage because its cannabis was considered as gold inter-

The people who submitted included Prime Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini, Minister for Housing and Urban Development Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza, National Commissioner of Police Isaac Magagula, lawyer Gigi Reid, and others.

Committee strongly warns against abuse of dagga

The abuse of the plant, according to the committee, could cause catastrophic health damages. They also expressed concerns on the lack of appropriate enabling regulatory framework in the country, to regulate the

THE committee, however, warned cannabis industry. The Opium and Habit Forming Drug Act 37 of 1922 allowed for the issuing of licences as unpacked in Subsection 1 and 2, but lacked provision on issuance of research licence. Another problem, according to the MPs, was that the country had no organised institutional framework to conduct and coordinate research in the cannabis and indigenous prod-

King Sobhuza II advised on dagga legalisation

HIS Majesty King Sobhuza II is said to have insisted that the issue of cannabis should be looked into, especially in Parliament.

This was said by Sipho Kopolane Dlamini from Chief Lovuthe Magongo at Elangeni. Dlamini, who was referred to as 'Umsizi' in the report, said the king was particular that the country had the first grade of cannabis.

The Umsizi said King Sobhuza II highlighted that cannabis could not be categorised as a drug but rather a herbal plant. A drug is a pharmaceutically synthesised component, while cannabis is described as very pure and an indigenous plant. According to the report, Dlamini narrated that "yini ngatsi kubandlululwa tsine. Kwesilungu bakuvuma konkhe. Asifuni kuphelelwa ngushukela."

In short, Dlamini was complaining that western medicine was deemed as the best while the traditional one was deemed as dangerous for human health. Dlamini also cited a scenario on how the beer industry came to be legalised in the country.

He said it was very difficult until

the change of name to food and beverages, then the launch took place.

Renowned traditional healer Nhlavana Maseko also noted before the committee that King Sobhuza II recalled Professor Lydia Makhubu to the University of Swaziland to pair up with them. They were mandated to work and preserve indigenous plants, thus they established a herbarium, which was later destroyed by UNISWA students.

This was an initiative where they were to make timbita (traditional medicine).

Organisations like SEDCO and NIDC were also consulted for purposes of establishing a factory.

Such factories were established in the Lubombo region. The late Prince Maphevu was the prime minister at that time. Maseko was sent to Germany to learn how to craft and mix the

Thereafter, 11 professors from the University of Bonn came in to endorse all necessary training. Cannabis, according to Maseko, was referred to as 'Mbewunkulu.'

NatCom says thanks but no thanks to nurses invite

SECURITY forces remain loyal and dedicated to the Government of Swaziland and will not partake in the march they have been invited to join next Tuesday relating to the on-going cost of living adjustment debacle.

National Commissioner of Police Isaac Magagula, speaking on behalf of the security forces, said they have been horrified by an article to the effect that members of the security forces have been invited to down tools and partake in a march to deliver a petition, related to the cost of living adjustment debacle between government and Public Sector Associations.

"We view such an invitation as act of mischievousness and delinquency of the highest order which cannot escape our harsh condemnation," said Magagula vesterday.

NatCom said it should be known and appreciated by all and sundry that it is virtually unthinkable for members of the security forces to relinquish their day to day responsibilities which are categorised by law as essential service to take part in such actions.

He said they took an oath to serve government and the country with utmost loyalty and dedication.

He said members of the security forces have their own channels and structures through which they address issues that affect their conditions of service, and marches or demonstrations are definitely not and can never be one of those.

"To this end, with all due humility, we request public sector associations not to legitimise whatever they are currently doing by using and dragging the name of the security forces in the mud," he said.

He assured the nation of their continued devotion to duty and loyalty to the badge and affirms none of their members will heed to the invitation next Tuesday when they march to the ministry of public service to demand answers on who was responsible for bypassing the joint negotiations forum and issued secret salary increase to some senior government.

The invitation was extended to security forces by nurses during their march on Wednesday to deliver a petition to the Prime Minister Dr Sibusiso Dlamini's office.

Public servants are expected to down tools next Tuesday and take to the street over salary scale adjustments for some senior officers.

The adjustments came at a time when government is offering zero per cent increase to public servants this financial year, owing to financial strain.







5% OF ASIANS ARE AUTHENTIC

THE report on the influx of Asians in the country revealed that only five per cent of Asians entering through KM III Airport are authentic.

This was said by one immigration officer based at King Mswati III (KM III) International Airport.

The officer wanted to speak on condition of anonymity. The officer could only be referred to as Immigration Officer 6. The officer told the committee of MPs investigating the Asian

influx that out of 20 people who entered through the airport in a day, only one would be authentic.

People from Pakistan, India, and Bangladesh, according to the officer, were the ones entering the country in large numbers.

Normally

The Asians who normally went to the airport to fetch one another would have difficulty in recognising one another and some of these Asians were trafficked into the country. Most Indians did not even know where they were headed to.

There are allegations to the effect that some of the police officers stationed at the airport were bribed with E3 000 per Asian to allow some undeserving Asians enter into the country.

Some of the Asians who entered into the country were trafficked to South Africa and Mozambique.

Some immigration officers are said to be paid E8 000 in every six months in payment of visas.

The officer mentioned that most of the corruption was practiced by home affairs officials, who were linked to 'big guns' at headquarters. The Indians who entered through the airport without necessary documents could not even speak English. They would say "no English please." Other immigration officers at Lomahasha and Mhlumeni Border Gates said on average, 20 Asians entered through these entry points in a week. They came with documents written "Visa on Arrival." Sometimes, they would call the headquarters and they would be told to wait for faxing of relevant documents.

Release

Later, they would be told to release the Asians since the fax machine was faulty or the internet was down.

Police officers at the two border gates said they see would many Asians coming into the country, but surprisingly, they could not see as many of them exiting the country.

They also told the committee that they would only act when called upon by immigration officers, otherwise they were not responsible for immigration processes.

When they acted on their own, they would get rebuked by some of the immigration officers, or even the Asians as they seemed to know the police were not responsible for immigration processes.

The police suggested that immigration processes should be done by police officers, as it was the case in some countries.

The police said they would be better placed to do the job because suspects would easily be recognised.

They said police were trained to read individuals from their walk, talk and looks, among other things.

Corruption network gets Asians in the country

THE influx of Asians in the country is said to be masterminded by a certain corruption network within home affairs and Interpol.

The alleged officers at the centre of the cartel include Home Affairs Principal Secretary Anthony Masilela, Acting Chief Immigrations Officer Makhosi Simelane, and Interpol Director Christopher Lukhele.

This is contained in the findings of the report of the Asian influx in the country.

Bribery and nepotism is said to be very rife at the immigrations department at home affairs. The problem could be caused by the fact that the post of substantive chief immigration officer has remained vacant for the past four years. The deputy chief immigration officer is acting on the position.

Tasks

Tasks of the office are also said to be shared on rotational basis.

King Mswati III International Airport and Mhlumeni Border Gates are said to be the most porous for illegal immigrants, particularly those from Bangladesh, India, and Pakistan.

Visa-on-Arrivals, Memos, Visitors Passes, and Dependant Passes were some of the documents used to allow immigrants into the country.

Most of the foreign business people found in the rural areas came through trading licences owned by local business people, who leased them. Some foreigners came through chiefs and obtain identity cards through 'kukhonta' system. Some immigrants get to rural areas as 'Bakhwenyana' (sons-in-law) after marrying Swazi women.

When there are joint raids with other relevant ministries, including SRA, the Asians literally run away, or just lock themselves inside their shops.

Chiefs and their administration structures would not be remunerated. The MPs recommended that the position of chief immigration officer should be filled with utmost urgency.

Masilela and Simelane at home affairs should be transferred promptly after the adoption of the report by Parliament.

Lukhele, the MPs recom-

mended, should be re-deployed because he was alleged to be in a corrupt rela-

tionship with the two above-mentioned officers to let in the illegal immigrants. The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) must, within 30 days from the removal of the three officers, investigate all temporary residence permits and all related documents, back-dating 20 years.

All immigrants should be deported and if need be, re-applications should be done from their countries of origin.

TANDARD CHANGES APPLY

GOVT, UNIONS BACK IN COURT NOVEMBER 3

FOLLOWING the deadlock between government and public sector unions over the zero percent cost of living offer, the Industrial Court has issued yet another order calling upon both parties to go back to the drawing board and find a lasting solution to the mat-

The last time the matter was before court, Industrial Court Acting Judge President Nkosinathi Nkonyane had stated that both parties should amicably find a solution into the matter and report to the court on how far they have gone.

It, however, transpired that the status quo remains as it is, hence the court gave both parties yet another opportunity to find a lasting solution into the cost of living adjustment negotiations and ordered that the matter will be back in court on November 3.

Appeared

The last time the parties appeared in court, the unions' lawyer Lucky Howe submitted that government (public service ministry) continues to negotiate in bad faith as regards the cost of living adjustment.

Howe submitted that they have been pushed to a corner by the respondent but they do not want to

resolve to a strike action as this is the last resort.

Judge Nkonyane had advised both parties to at least engage a third party in the negotiations in order to reach a peaceful and lasting solution and that for now the court cannot deal with the matter as it is between both parties.

The four public sector unions; Swaziland Association of Teachers (SNAT), Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP), Swaziland Nurses Association (SNA) and the National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) filed an urgent application as regards the matter.

The unions sought an order directing the ministry of public service (respondent) to return to the negotiations table to negotiate in good faith and not deliberately stall the process of negotiations and that such should be done within three days of the court order.

They further sought an order declaring that both parties when at the table they use as a variable and as a basis in the negotiation process, the inflation rate over the past year (2016) as one of the paramount factors in the negotiation process when determining the said rate to be used for the cost of living adjustment.

According to the unions, in their papers filed at the Industrial Court, the cause of action between the parties emanates from an agreement signed between the parties dated July 5, 2017 as the agreement outlines the need for the parties to negotiate as a collective bargaining and it governs the relationship between the parties.

Agreement

The agreement was signed voluntarily by all the applicants and the respondent as the governing instrument between them during the process of negotiations which included bargaining in good faith and balance the needs of the government and the civil servants.

During the negotiations, the unions state in their papers that the respondent's representatives requested permission to get authority on the demand by the applicants which what 9.15% and requested two weeks to do same.

However, Zwelithini Mndzebele on behalf of the unions submitted that on their return, the respondents representatives advised that they were only authorised to give the zero per cent offer and gave no reasons, a thing that happened over three meetings.

The respondent further asked the unions at another meeting as to where government should get the money from.

"I must state that we were taken aback by this as the respondent was not bona fide in his negotiations, had he been, he would have stated why he could only offer zero per cent but took the matter as a joke and was not serious about the negotiations," Mndzebele submitted.

Controlling

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Public Service Evart Madlopha, as the controlling officer, is part of the negotiations team.

This conduct displayed by the respondent seemed to be one which lacks the seriousness and respect that he ought to take such matter with seriousness according to the unions since this is a matter of national interest and goes to the core of the existence of the kingdom and the business of the ministry.

They argued that the ministry would not be in existence had it not been the presence of the members of the unions and the nation but chooses to be disrespectful in his conduct of his business with them.

Nurses' 'go slow' fails to take off

THE much anticipated nurses' 'go slow' and picketing which was expected to start yesterday did not take off as anticipated by many.

The industrial war between government and nurses was expected to start yesterday in all the government hospitals in the country.

The nurses association had on Wednesday during the march to the prime minister's office to deliver the petition vowed to embark on a 'go slow' as of yesterday.

According to sources inside the hospitals the 'go slow' did not take off as anticipated. "There is nothing to report, it was business as usual at Pigg's Peak, Mbabane and Mankavane Government Hospitals," said the source, who only said there was unhealthy relationship between the nurses and the patients.

Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWAD-NU) President, Bheki Mamba said the 'go slow' and picketing could spell disaster for patients as the last time nurses went on a go slow things did not look good in hospitals.

Patients in some hospitals were left stranded. The nurses are demanding that the prime minister addresses the Emkhuzweni Health Centre issue which has dragged for too long.

The matter involves a patient who reportedly experienced complications after delivery and nurses were fingered for the mess up.

A probe was set up and nurses feel it is targeted at them. The go-slow comes at a time when the country is faced with an outbreak of Malaria. Already three people are confirmed dead while hundreds are getting treatment.

On Wednesday, hundreds of nurses took to the streets and marched to the PM's office to deliver a petition that outlined all their con-

THE country is committed reducing new HIV infections by 75 per cent in an effort to keep up with the HIV prevention roadmap which seeks to accelerate HIV prevention.

The country made this commitment while participating in the inaugural meeting of the Global HIV Prevention Coalition held in Geneva, Switzerland last week, during which the HIV prevention roadmap 2020 was also launched.

The coalition chaired by the Executive Directors of UNAIDS and UNFPA, brought together United Nations member states, civil society, international organisations and other partners agree on the roadmap, as part of efforts to reduce new HIV infections by 75 per cent by 2020. The HIV prevention 2020 roadmap contains a 10-point action plan that lays out immediate concrete steps countries need to take to accelerate progress.

Steps include; conducting up-to-date analysis to assess where the opportunities are for maximum impact, developing guidance to identify gaps and actions for rapid scale-up, training to develop

expertise in HIV prevention and on developing networks and addressing legal and policy barriers to reach the people most affected by HIV, including young people and key populations.

This new roadmap seeks to ensure that 90 per cent of people at risk of HIV infection have access to comprehensive HIV prevention services. It builds on the joint global 90-90-90 targets whose

aim is to ensure that 90 per cent of people living with HIV get to know their status, 90 per cent of these people are put on ARVs and 90 per cent of people on treatment have suppressed viral loads.

The HIV prevention roadmap comes at an opportune time when the country accelerates momentum to achieve the ambitious targets of 2016 United Nations General Assembly Political Declaration of Ending AIDS. The Swaziland delegation was led by Secretary to Cabinet Mbuso Dlamini, who stated:

"The roadmap is a key vehicle to take Swaziland forward in reaching the ambitious but achievable targets of ending AIDS by 2022 in Swaziland as envisaged by His Majesty King Mswati III".


Dlamini appealed to international donors and partners to continue to sup-

port the country by sustaining funding of the response and providing technical assistance to avert new infections so that the country can be able to achieve the set targets by 2020. UNAIDS estimates that around one quarter of HIV budgets should be allocated to HIV prevention as many countries were spending less than 10 per cent of their HIV budgets on prevention and many international donors were spending less than a quarter.

Participated

One key follow-up is that countries that participated in the meeting would develop a 100-day plan for immediate actions including setting national targets, reviewing the progress made against the plan after 100 days, reassessing their national prevention programmes and taking immediate remedial action.

Other members of the delegation from Swaziland included NERCHA Executive Director Khanya Mabuza, SAFAIDS Country Representative Mandisa Zwane-Machakata and CANGO Grants Coordinator Nqobile Tsabedze-Msibi.



FOLLOWING a proposal by the ministry of housing and urban development during the 25th Technical Monitoring Committee (TMC) meeting for procurement of equipment for basic solid waste management in 2016, the Republic Of China (Taiwan) has approved the proposal for the procurement of equipment amounting to E12 679 320.76.

The equipment which was officially handed over yesterday includes an excavator (dozer), landfill compactor, low-bed trailer and horse (horse-andtrailer) and a self-compacting refuse truck.

It was handed over by Taiwan Ambassador Thomas Chen to the Minister of Housing and Urban Development Prince Hlangusemphi at the Central Transport Administration (CTA) in Matsapha on Wednesday.

Revealed

During the event it was revealed that the equipment is to be shared by the small towns including Siteki, Nhlangano, Hlathikhulu, Hluthi, Lavumisa, Malkems, Ngwenya, and Mankayane.

Tawaian Ambassador Chen in his remarks said the amount for purchasing the above-mentioned equipment totaled US\$975,332.37 (E12 679 320.76), which was funded by the Republic of China (Taiwan).

He said the government of China made an initial payment of US\$ 585 199.42 (60 per cent) which was disbursed to commence its implementation in early May this year, leaving a

He said the equipment will go a long way in improving refuse collection, land clearance and solid waste management in the aforementioned small towns.



They stated that they have a right to information pertaining to the affairs of the hospital in particular during the period where they were excluded from participating in the management of the affairs of the company.

In their papers filed before court the two stated that they do not even know whether there has been compliance with statutory duties which require that the company holds annual general meetings and board meetings.

Investigations

They further stated in their papers that it is this lack of transparency and compliance with laws that necessitates that the affairs of the company

be investigated in a manner that is not intrusive and disruptive to the operations of the company.

"The investigation is proposed to be done in a manner that entails the availing and disclosure of information to them as representatives of shareholder that has been marginalised in the management of the affairs of the com-

pany," Busisiwe stated in her affidavit.

As shareholders, they submitted that the Estate has a right to have the affairs of the company investigated by a Forensic Auditor particularly because Dr Rukundo has totally marginalised the Estate in the management of the affairs of the joint venture company.

In their papers they argue that their late mother's contribution to the joint venture at the hospital was a piece of land being portion 7 of ERF No 369 situated at Kelly Street in Manzini measuring 2855 square metres with its value standing at approximately

inding at approxim E9 million.

It is on this piece of land that the hospital was built and the funds for building it were sourced from the Swaziland Industrial Development Company who mortgaged the property for E8 800 000 (Eight Million Eight hundred Thousand Emalangeni).

Disagreement

They argue that there was no capital contribution from Dr Rukundo and this was and still is the point of serious disagreement between

their late mother, her Estate and Rukundo.

"It is opposite to state that the late Dr Tshabalala was our mother and she involved us in this project for the establishment of the hospital because it was a family investment and we were well acquainted with the project from it's inception, the late Tshabalala kept us abreast and would appraise us on every development concerning the project," they submitted.

They argued that when their mother passed away in March 2013, they were appointed as joint Executrixes of the Estate and by virtue of that capacity they became the joint shareholder representatives in the joint venture.

Estate

Apart from usurping control of the joint venture in the hospital they alleged that Dr Rukundo unilaterally stopped monthly payments of E65 000 to the Estate as a shareholder, the monthly payments started during the time of their late mother.

They argued that Dr Rukundo clearly had no right to alter an agreement between shareholders and to unilaterally stop payments, and his actions are prejudicial to the Estate and these are grounds to claim by the Estate against him.

Busisiwe submitted that she was appointed as board member of the joint venture company during their late mother's time as she served as a director until February 2015 when the board of directors was dissolved by Dr Rukundo using, as a basis, a

legal opinion by his attorneys that the board was not properly constituted.

They allege that they are entitled to participate fully in the management of the affairs of the hospital as it is a joint venture and that Dr Rukundo's breach of good faith and his obligations to his co-shareholder entitles them to bring the present application before court for the relief sought.

Order

The duty of full disclosure of all company affairs according to them is a duty Dr Rukundo owes to them as shareholders in the joint venture.

"I submit that the applicants have made out a case for the relief sought as such relief flows directly from the respective duties the shareholders owe to each other, they are an incidence of law flowing directly from the nature of their relationship," Busisiwe stated. She stated that Dr Rukundo's conduct is a threat to the joint venture company and it is important that the Honorable Court intervenes to prevent a perpetuation of the Rukundo's unlawful conduct and to protect the right of the Estate as shareholder to participate in the management of the affairs of the company.

This is a proper case according to Busisiwe in which the court should exercise its discretion and grant the orders sought by the applicants.


so we can generate money to buy more seeds next year," explained Matsebula.

35 preceptors trained to assist nursing students

THE ministry of health with support from the World Health Organisation and USAID has trained about 35 preceptors who will assist nursing students during practical classes.

The five-day workshop began on Monday at the George Hotel in Manzini and was led by WHO Human Resource for Health Advisor Dr James

Preceptors from 11 clinical sites and hospitals attended the training.

Preceptors are practicing nurses who assist nursing students with their practical during their visits to health facilities including wards and clinics.

Phindile Mashwama, a lecturer at the Southern African Nazarene University (SANU) and also Chairperson of the Preceptorship Technical Working Group explained that nurses after graduating with their first Degree become eligible to be precep-

"All nurses who have graduated with their Degree in Nursing and have two-year experience are required to mentor others who are still studying without additional compensation. They are called preceptors," she said.

She explained that the training was not meant for giving the nurses extra duties but merely equipping them with skills to enhance what they were already doing.

Mashwama said the training was to equip the preceptors with the right attitude and skill to transfer their knowledge to the upcoming student nurses. The practicals are basically for helping student nurses to practice the theoretical things that they have learnt in class.

Mashwama stated that it is important that nurses have the theoretical knowledge which they will put into practice whilst modelling a positive attitude towards patients.

She said the idea was to standardise the preceptorship practice which will be applied in students from all the four nursing schools in the country-SANU, UNISWA, Good Shepherd College and Swaziland Christian University.

"Attitude is very important. Preceptors need to model a positive attitude which they will impart to the nursing students. Attitude can enhance or deter the relationship between the nurse and a patient," she said.

Mashwama explained that in order to deliver quality health care, nurses needed to have the competency and skills in assessing the patient, hence they need someone to school them on how things are done when assisting a patient.

The practical usually takes from four to six weeks, after which students are evaluated.

During the training preceptors raised concerns about the number of students assigned to each preceptor at a given time. They requested that the number should be controlled to at least five students per preceptor. This will enable adequate supervision and students.

Mashwama further mentioned that a preceptorship programme framework has been developed which will guide preceptors on how to help students during their practical. These trainings will continue and the aim is to train over 100 nurses.





The computers were handed over to the respective chiefdoms by Ambassador Lisa Peterson during a ceremony organised by USAID at Mountain Inn on Wednesday.



more consistent tracking," said Peterson. She further highlighted that since

She further highlighted that since 2014, their PEPFAR programme through USAID's partner HC3, have been working alongside the ministry of tinkhundla, ministry of health, and NERCHA to reinforce the capacity of traditional leaders to reduce the impact of HIV in their own communities. NDMA, WORLD VISION PROVIDE FOOD TO 40 000 CITIZENS

NATIONAL Disaster Management Agency (NDMA), through World Vision, provided food to close to 40 000 citizens from areas affected by El Nino including constituencies such as Lubulini, Lomahasha, Nkilongo and Madlangempisi.

The exact number of residents that benefited was 39 785.

This figure translates to 45 communities from 8 175 households which benefited from the Integrated Food Security Population Classification (IPC) once off food distribution. The agency donated 221 tons of food that included rice and vegetable oil, which was donated by Taiwan and mealies donated by the government.

Each beneficiary received a 5kg of rice and 500 ml of vegetable oil. At Gamula, each beneficiary received 7kg of mealies and the same quantity of vegetable oil.

Beneficiaries were happy with the food relief as they have not harvested anything due to the scorch-

ing heat and some, like Mangwaneni at Nkilongo, have no land to farm.

One of the beneficiaries, Emellina Nxumalo, appreciated the food aid and said, "I really like this programme because we have received rice and oil, at least we will have that and have to make means to get other food items that we need,

unlike when you have nothing at all and have to buy everything."

Emellina has received food aid for as long as she can remember and shared that she is a recipient for her family of seven.

She resides at Mangwaneni and has a few rooms built from stick and mud that she shares with her

children and grandchildren.

She also compared the aid to the Cash Based Transfers programme and said, "This one is not like the Cash Based Transfer programme which I most preferred for its options in buying food.

There we would also save money to use once the food is finished yet with the food parcels, we have to keep and our homes are not conducive for storing." When drawn to the prospect of rains, Emellina gave a hopeless sigh and said she does not foresee getting any rains at the area as it's already October, a time when everyone goes to their field to plough. She added that even if it does rain, they have no land to farm, the soil is rocky and very dry, and nothing ever grows there.

She pleaded that NDMA and World Vision continue with the food assistance because they are in need of food aid.

"We have no hope now that this is a once off distribution yet we need food but we trust that God, who has carried us through all these years, will see us through again," said Emellina.

Gamula community appreciates food aid

BUCOPHO of Gamula Mbongeni Ndzinisa expressed gratitude for the food aid they received and said the community was still faced with serious food scarcity.

He revealed that they had conducted a survey before to understand the economic status of the community and it revealed shocking statistics.

"This situation is bad because of the drought. Only 15 per cent of the community has job security, about 25 per cent have seasonal employment and the rest are unemployed and mostly that is the youth. In total, there are about 5 500 people who reside here," he explained

Rain

Ndzinisa shared that an average family has between seven to 10 family members. He also said the community has not had a harvest for almost 10 years now and that their region (Lubombo) also receives the smallest rainfall yet it is too hot.

Appreciating the food Ndzinisa said, "This food will help the people a lot because they will have something to eat these days although it won't last long." He also appealed to the government to continue with providing food aid for all.

He explained that most of the people who were better in the past are now amongst the most vulnerable due to loss of employment

At Gamula, they were receiving 7kg of mealie meal and vegetable oil per beneficiary.

ANOTHER DAY IN SD, ANOTHER TOYI-TOYI

NEXT Tuesday promises to be filled with action as public servants will abandon their work stations to protest against secret salary scale adjustments announced this week.

After all had been done and dusted, Principal Secretary Evart Madlopha emerged the runaway pacifier offering by issuing what he believes to be reasonable and legitimate explanation on why government had moved to make the adjustments without the knowledge of the public servants with whom he is supposedly at the table of negotiations over the same issues.

On the other hand, security services are bracing themselves for a dramatic showdown that will be handsomely rewarded in overtime claims resulting from the duration of the toyi-toyi which is more likely to be prolonged given government's steadfastness in offering only zero salary adjustments to the entire civil service of lesser value.

Government will also spend incalculable amounts of fuel and wear and tear on vehicles running helter skelter in an effort to block Mphandlana Shongwe and allies from joining the street dances.

Comprising

The practice has been to drive Mphandlana all the way from Mbabane to his parental home at Nkonjwa near Sithobela, complete with a long convoy comprising the top brass all at the taxpayers' cost.

Hospitals are most likely to be without the Nightingales despite that they are perceived to be in the essential services, who in the essential service can deliver a service on an empty stomach, none other than police, warders and soldiers with unlimited rations both at barracks and during the citizens bashing sessions in the form of hefty lunches supplied by high flying trucks carrying doggy bags.

But we have always observed ten-

dencies by the government of the day before vacating office that together with the colluding Parliament they prepare for a grand exit by issuing ludicrous circulars that will guarantee not only themselves but also their spouses benefits from the ever willing cash cow, the state coffers.

The idea is to get married shortly before exiting and channel the spouse to be accommodated into the scales that will result in reaping the highest of benefits on offer to politicians' spouses. These and other similar circulars are commonplace on the eve of the exit date 20/3/14.

As early as 2023/14, state employees demanded a fair salary review that will be the equiv alent of that which was given politicians in the Eighth Parliament. During that period (2003 to 2008), politicians benefitted from, among other increments, the introduction of Circular No.3 of 2005.

Parliament Deputy Presiding Officers received a 174.5% increment while parliamentarians had theirs increased by 120.77%. The Circular No.3 of 2005 also led to Cabinet ministers, including the prime minister, having their salaries increased by over 42 per cent.

The boss, the PM, was paid a monthly basic salary of E22 235 before the circular was introduced before it skyrocketed to E31 647 after the introduction of the circular. The monthly basic salary for parliamentarians before the 2005 circular was E12 365, rising to E29 000 per month.

However, following the review of

Finance Circular No.1 of 2010, the newly elected lawmakers woke up to shocking news that their salary structure was to undergo a slight decrease compared to the previous government.

Finance Circular No.2 of 2013, had the PM's salary cut by approximately E4 000. In the previous government, the PM received a basic salary of E55 588 monthly calculated on an annual salary of E667 056. In 2013, he was expected to take home E51 470 each month, hence his annual salary was E617 646.

"The basic salary of the prime minister of Swaziland will be benchmarked against similar sized (by GDP) SADC countries every two years; and discounted for economic conditions and the affordability of the Swaziland Government. The annual review of salaries will be applied based on the civil service annual review rate."

All other parliamentarian salaries were to be determined as a ratio of the prime minister's salary. Previously, the basic salary of a minister stood at E42 353 based on an annual pay of E508 236.

The new ministers were each expected to pocket approximately E38 602 per month, resulting in a drop of E3 750. The cut on parliamentarians was just about insignificant. Thereafter, there had been attempts to grease the exit packages of top politicians, these being lawmakers and Cabinet ministers, something that accumulated into the current anger and helplessness as expressed today by the civil servants who feel politicians have not produced any rocket science to catapult the country out of its current miseries into a status of a contented and not disgruntled citizenry.

Returning

Evart Madlopha, the Principal Secretary and public service is returning to put to the test the intelligence of the civil service and the nation by blatantly saying politicians had been shortchanged while the civil servants ere deserving of the zero per cent salary adjustment because they have not added any value into the economy like the politicians.

These are the same politicians who have steered the country into the quagmire best analysed by the recent International Monetary Fund report. For all the mess, Madlopha says they are deserving to be rewarded, and handsomely so.

Whatever happens next week, no doubt it will put the country back into the world map and for the wrong reasons, as always. The protests shall be complementing the high statistics in HIV and AIDS, poverty levels, hunger, homelessness, the works.

SA'S MEDIA SHOULD BEWARE OF BEING THE VOICE OF ONLY SOME

MEDIA Freedom Day in South Africa marks the day in 1977 when the apartheid government banned two newspapers - World and Weekend World - and a church journal, Pro Veritate, along with 18 black consciousness organisations. A number of journalists were also detained.

One purpose of commemorating the day is to keep the memory alive so that people are more sensitive to contemporary trends that may again lead the country down the path of repression.

What does the picture look like today?

First some optimism: South African citizens would not have known the extent of the mess the country is in had it not been for the tireless efforts of investigative journalists that uncovered widespread corruption, brought the #Guptaleaks and exposed Bell Pottinger's complicity in stirring up racial tensions.

But that's where the good news ends.

Cause for concern

Media freedom continues to face external threats in the form of legislation, intimidation, harassment and surveillance.

Another major area of concern is that the South African media is not diverse enough: not in terms of ownership nor diversity of perspectives. This lack of diversity makes it harder for the media to claim to represent the public.

Even worse, the only significant "change" to media ownership this year turned out to be a cynical ploy to buy influence. This was the "purchase" of the Gupta-owned television station ANN7 and The New Age newspaper by their staunch defender and erstwhile government spokesperson Mzwanele Jimmy

All it achieved was to give media transformation a bad name.

The country is also on the back foot when it comes to the public broadcaster. South Africans are supposed to have one that works in the public interest and acts as a countervailing force to big commercial interests in the media. But, the South African Broadcasting Corporation (SABC) has been a mess for several years, hobbled by financial woes and mismanagement.

Political interference in the running of public broadcaster runs all the way to President Jacob Zuma. After sitting on the recommendations for the new SABC board for weeks, the board he finally appointed included a controversial chairperson and deputy. He also appointed yet another minister of communications, the seventh in so many years, suggesting that communications just isn't a priority for government.

But threats to media freedom don't always come from the outside, from security agencies or politicians.

Disconnect

Research shows that the South African media often doesn't succeed in gaining the trust of audiences outside of the mainstream elite, such as the poor or the youth.

The disconnect between mainstream media and audiences on the margins of society is perhaps best illustrated by the way media report on community protests: routinely covered only insofar as they present an inconvenience for the middle classes.

Attempts to engage with protesters, find out why they were protesting, why they don't opt for other forms of engagement and what has led to the breakdown in trust, are rare - partly as a result of constraints on journalists.

By adding to the marginalisation of these citizens, the media is in danger of being associated with narrow or sectarian interests.

Importantly, it needs to be borne in mind that media freedom exists not only for the media but to serve all citizens.

The South African media have done exemplary work on many fronts in recent years. Yet, for media freedom to become deeply entrenched in the country's democracy, it should strive to listen even more widely and more intently to the voices of those that are still not within earshot of the mainstream news.

In doing so - especially in a communications landscape awash with propaganda, fake news and spin the media would gain the trust of citizens and find more allies in their much-needed resistance to the creeping authoritarianism in South African

WHY taking a two-week break from your diet might be the key to shifting those last few kilos

Most people who are trying to lose weight know how pesky those final couple of kilos can be, with some choosing to heavily monitor everything they consume.

Luckily, new research from the University of Tasmania's School of Health Sciences suggests that taking breaks from your diet can help you to reach your goal faster.

"When we reduce our energy [food] intake during dieting, resting metabolism decreases to a greater extent than expected; a phenomenon termed "adaptive thermogenesis" - making weight loss harder to achieve," Professor Nuala Byrne, who led the study, told Body+Soul.

The research looked at two different groups - one dieted continuously for 16 weeks and the other group dieted intermittently.

The group of intermittent dieters would diet for two weeks and then would take two weeks off, which was a pattern they followed for the whole study.

Research

Once the research was completed, the study leaders found that the group that was more successful in weight loss was the one who took two-week

The positive results don't stop there, as six months after the study finished the intermittent dieters maintained an average weight loss of eight kilos.


This was more than those who dieted continuously and monitored their food. This being said, Professor Byrne explained that diets that include cycles of several days of fasting and feasting aren't more effective than con-

[for a two week" duration] may be critical to the success of this approach" he said.

Once the research was completed they found that the group that was more successful in weight loss was those who took breaks from their diet

Although the results of this trial may have some people jumping for joy, dietitian Kathryn Hawkins doesn't necessarily agree.

She believes that people should adopt a more intuitive and healthier approach to eating and thinks that restricting food doesn't help long-

"There is enough evidence to show that learning to enjoy healthy food, listening to your hunger [and] fullness cues, and moving every day is the best way to help your body to settle on a healthy weight"

She stated that long-term restriction slows down your metabolism and suggests listening to your body's hunger cues.

"By ignoring [your] body cues, the body ends up feeling unsupported and therefore ends up deciding to slow down its metabolism to preserve energy" Ms Hawkins said

Hawkins said that the best approach is to be consistent with when you consume your food.

She also believes we should follow the basic rules and eat fresh food, lots of fruit and vegetables, wholegrains, lean meats, legumes, nuts, eggs and dairy. Daily Mail

Butchers, farm shops under the spotlight over chicken containing food poisoning bug

...after watchdog sees fall in contaminated supermarket chicken

Butchers and farm shops are under the spotlight amid allegations they are selling dirty chicken.

At the same time, the Food Standards Agency (FSA) is scaling back the policing of supermarkets, despite evidence of hygiene failures at their processing plants.

New figures from the FSA show more than half of chickens sold across the High Street - 54 per cent - carry the food poisoning bug campylobacter.

And more than one in 20 6.5 per cent - carry high levels on the skin, which means they are especially dangerous.

Campylobacter is the leading cause of food poisoning in the UK and makes 280 000 people ill each year.

Most people suffer sickness and diarrhoea, but complications can lead to temporary paralysis and even death with some 100 fatalities a year. The year-long results, from August 2016

to July 2017, based on 3 980 whole fresh chickens, show Marks and Spencer's chickens had the highest overall presence of campylobacter at 62.7 per cent, followed by Asda (57.1 per cent) and Aldi (56.7 per cent).

The FSA figures show the proportion of fresh roasting chicken that carry any contamination has come down from 74 per cent to a still high 54 per cent over the past three years.

Over the same period, the number carrying the highest level of contamination has dropped has dropped from 22 per cent to 6.5 per cent. Contamination levels are highest in chickens sold by small butchers, farmers markets and farm shops. Some 71.6 per cent carry

the bug and 17.1 per cent have the highest levels of contamination. Waitrose is selling the safest chickens but even then it is selling 38.6 per cent of chickens that carry campylobacter [and 2.7per cent have high levels].

Tesco was selling 46.7 per cent of chickens with campylobacter and Sainsbury's with 52.8 per cent. Despite that the FSA announced last month that it is to stop naming individual supermarkets and the proportion of chickens they sell that are contaminated with campylobacter.

The watchdog has regu-

larly reported the percentage of chickens sold with campylobacter by the nine biggest supermarkets - Aldi, Asda, Co-op, Lidl, Marks and Spencer, Morrisons. Sainsbury's, Tesco and Waitrose - since 2014.

Some 73 per cent of chickens sold in the High Street in 2014-15 were carrying campylobacter, according to the Food Standards Agency (FSA). The FSA said it had reached an agreement with the industry for supermarkets to publish their own figures while it focused on smaller establishments 'where we feel further improvements could be made'.



SMES INCORPORAT IN KEY SUPPLY CHAINS

GOVERNMENT is currently working hard to incorporate small and medium enterprises (SMEs) in key supply chains.

Speaking during the Shiselweni Entrepreneur of the Regional Awards held at Nhlangano Casino, Minister of Commerce Industry and Trade Minister Jabulani Mabuza said government, through some ministries such as the ministry of agriculture, ministry of natural resources and energy and the ministry of commerce, industry and trade, has prioritised participation of the SMME sector in key supply chains through value addition.

"We believe this will enhance access to better markets for our products," he said.

He noted that though the Shiselweni region recorded the lowest number of entrants for the competition, it added diversity in the competition, since most businesses from the region were dominated by forestry and timber production.

"This therefore places a challenge on SMEs to play a more prominent role in the supply chain of this industry," he said. Mabuza said the Shiselweni region accounted for about 16 per cent of the 59 000 SMME owners in the country.

"These figures show that there is still a lot that the country needs to do to promote entrepreneurship in the region," he said.

However, the minister said the region has the second highest number of self-employed entrepreneurs at 79 per cent, after Lubombo at 86 per cent.

He said about 15 per cent of the businesses in the region were at micro level and employed at least up to three people.

Mabuza thanked the organisations that sponsored this year's awards.

"Your contribution to this noble venture is commendable. This year the EYA competition is bigger and better. The introduction of the regional awards has resulted in a 45 per cent increase in the number of entrants. This validates our proposition that taking EYA beyond the urban corridor of Manzini-Mbabane is necessary to advance the agenda of entrepreneurship development," he said.

E20BN RAIL LINK PROJECT TO USE SPV MODEL TO RAISE FUNDS

By Majaha Nkonyane

THE E20 billion Rail Link project between the country and South Africa is working on a Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) model to raise funds for the project.

This is according to Swaziland Railway CEO Stephenson Ngubane.

"The model we are working on now is the SPV. This means that we are looking to attract project financing and that the revenue generated will be used to pay back investors and meet operating costs. After maybe 20 or 25 years, or when the loans have been repaid, the SPV would dissolve. The model is continually being refined," he reportedly told Engeneering News.

The SPV model was also preferred in light of the fact that the project, which would be seamless, despite traversing country borders, already involved two rail operators, covered a relatively short distance, and would integrate with existing infrastructure.

Mountainous

The infrastructure would also need to traverse challenging, at to take direct equity times mountainous, terrain and its construction is expected to comprise no less than 300 separate civil engineering works, including bridges and culverts.

"We are confident that the project will attract private investors, owing to the fact that there are immediate volumes that could be diverted to the line. Yearly volumes are expected to ramp up to 22 million tons over time," said Transnet Freight Rail (TRF) CEO Ravi Nair.

The 150 km Greenfield railway line from Lothair, in South Africa, to Sidvokodvo, is designed to open up a dedicated general-freight cor-

ridor, firstly to the Port of Richards Bay, in KwaZulu-Natal, but later also to the Port of Maputo, Mozambique.

Swaziland Railway (SR) earlier said the line, which would integrate with TFR's network on either side of the country's border, would also release

capacity on the coal export corridor, which currently handles between 15 and 17 million tons of general

freight yearly. "By relieving the corridor of almost all its general freight, TFR would align the rail network with the coalhandling capacity that exists at Richards Bay in a bid to facilitate an increase in exports, initially from the country's Mpumalanga coal mines, but progressively from the Waterberg, in Limpopo, and eventually also from neighbouring Botswana," said SR.

Transnet is in the process of acquiring the 506 hectares of land required for the project on the South African side of the border and was in discussions with communities on the relocation of several households.

Meanwhile, it has been reported that SR in the country is in talks with 15 chiefdoms regarding the relocation of 235 homesteads to make way for the project.

About 500 graves have already been exhumed and the bodies reburied, while Transnet was in talks regarding the exhumation of 120 graves.

GOVERNMENT's collaboration with development partners, the private sector and local authorities has played a significant role to strengthen food production and the creation of more high-productivity employment.

Going forward, Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati said the sector would focus on strengthening water harvesting and irrigation programmes to safeguard smallholder farmers' linkages to market and to continue attracting investments to rural areas.

"Government in partnership with the private sector, development partners and local authorities has continued to lead to ensure success of rural development projects aimed at poverty eradication and strengthening livelihoods for food and nutrition security," he said.

He said more than 2 000 direct jobs have been created under these programmes, with a turnover of E1.4 billion over the past five years.

Therefore, he said it was critical for the sector to continuously work on improving sustainability of these programmes, while scaling up to other regions of the country and facilitating strengthening of associated commodity value chains.

He said other interventions included supporting household nutrition gardens, food preparation and processing, access to affordable inputs for crops and livestock, small stock enterprises development and mechanisation.

The minister also noted that resulting from food security programmes interventions, where farmers were supported with access to inputs and efficient agricultural services; there has been a significant decline in levels of malnutrition with stunting in particular declining from 31 per cent in 2014 to 22 per cent in 2016.

Also, he said the establishment and capacitating of the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA) has played a critical role to support communities severely affected by the 2015-2016 drought.

"The enforcement of environmental policies has ensured that all our environmental programme issues are mainstreamed," he said

However, he said the rolling out of these programmes was not without challenges.

"Resources are barely adequate, climate change effects are devastating, population and food demand is rising, while our institutions remain static," he said. Therefore, he said there was a need to mobilise and hamess all the support required to arrest the deterrent challenges in implementation of these programmes.

Vilakati said the country had been recently assessed and found to be one of the member states that were on track towards achieving the Malabo targets by 2025.

This was during the recently held ministerial session of the second meeting of the Specialised Technical Committee (STC) on agriculture, rural development, water and environment organ of the African Union (AU).

He said 43 indicators were used to access the country's progress towards achieving the Malabo targets.

These included the recommitment to the principles and values of the CAADP process; recommitment to enhance investment finance in agriculture, a commitment to end hunger by 2025 including doubling productivity, reducing stunting to 10 per cent, commitment to boost intra-African trade in agricultural commodities and services and enhancing resilience in livelihoods and production systems to climate variability and other shocks.

He said some of the areas that the country needs to improve on included reducing the poverty headcount rate ratio and employment creation for youth in agriculture value chains, improving public budget allocation to the sector and social protection to meet the needs of vulnerable groups and strengthening agriculture data collection and management systems to ensure that missing data would be captured in the next biennial review reporting in 2019.

The Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness Management graduate was responding to His Majesty's recent call for graduates and scholars to come up with solutions to help the country reduce its reliance on SACU revenues which he said was not healthy for the economy. Rand slumps to one-week low, JSE up

JOHANNESBURG - The rand slipped to a one-week low against the dollar yesterday, hurt by a combination of a firmer dollar, higher-than-expected inflation print and negative sentiment spurred by recent cabinet changes.

Stocks posted modest gains with randhedged companies benefiting from the weaker currency.

At 5pm, the rand bid at R13.5566 to the dollar, 10.32c softer than at the same

time on Tuesday, trading at its weakest levels since October11.

"The stronger dollar is hurting most emerging market currencies," Rand Merchant Bank currency trader, Jan Sluis-Cremer, said. "Inflation also printed marginally higher than forecasts, and yesterday's (Tuesday's) Cabinet changes have added to the weaker rand."

Domestic headline consumer inflation quickened to 5.1 per cent year-onyear in September. In a list of 16 emerging market currencies tracked by Reuters, the rand was by far the worst performer, followed by the Mexican peso and Brazil's real.

President Jacob Zuma on Tuesday reshuffled his Cabinet for a second time in seven months, rattling the rand and government bonds.

In fixed income, the yield for the benchmark government bond rose three basis points to 8.77 per cent.

On the stock market, the benchmark



JSE Top40 index was up 0.46 per cent at 51747.21 points, while the broader all share index climbed 0.47 per cent to 58152.41 points.

Rand hedges lifted the bourse. Britain-based property company Capital & Counties was up 4.35 per cent to R48.48, while luxury goods maker Richemont gained 1.8 per cent to R123.20. Steinhoff gained 1.25 per cent to R60.75.

ANGOLA NOT NEXT VENEZUELA AS STATE OIL FIRM CUTS DEBT

LONDON – Angola is not the next Venezuela, the head of state oil firm Sonangol said on Wednesday while pledging to further cut debt, even if both oil-rich nations have relied heavily on loans from China.

Venezuela, the Latin American oil behemoth, has found itself struggling to repay debts to China and Russia that total at least \$50 billion. But Sonangol chair Isabel dos Santos said her company was not on a similar track.

"There is really pretty much nothing in common," dos Santos said. "Maybe just the weather."

Dos Santos told a Reuters newsmaker event that Sonangol has already slashed \$3 billion in debt, and that she has the backing of the new president for an ambitious reform plans that aims to further cut debts.

"Our relations are in full alignment," dos Santos said, adding that João Lourenço, who took office last month, was "fully aware" of her plans for Sonangol's transformation.

Dos Santos took the helm of the state oil company in June 2016, when her father Jose Eduardo dos Santos was still in office. He stepped down as president this year after 38 years in power. But she said the new administration was on board with the "huge task" of her five-year turnaround plan for Sonangol.

"We are engaged with the government

and the government's mission to overcome the difficulties in the Angolan economy."

Sonangol was hit hard by the slump in oil prices that began in 2014. She said the company was "debt ridden" when she took the helm, but that there was no concern over outstanding loans from China, a key buyer of its oil and source of financing for Sonangol itself as well as Angola.

"There is no taboo (about) being financed by Chinese banks," she said, adding that they had cut total company debts to \$10 billion this year from \$13 billion.

She declined to give a figure for the total amount Sonangol owed to Chinese lenders, citing only \$3 billion from mainland Chinese banks.

But years of borrowing, particularly from China, left the nation with a dwindling amount of crude to sell for fresh revenue during the depths of the oil price crash, and others estimate its oilbacked debts to Chinese entities at at least \$25 billion.

'Gigaba should have taken another route on SAA'

JOHANNESBURG - Parliament's standing committee on finance said yesterday that it believed Finance Minister Malusi Gigaba should have used another route to provide financial rescue to SAA, but was correct overall in acting to prevent the national carrier from defaulting on its Citibank loan.

The committee issued a statement after a parliamentary legal adviser found that the R3billion bailout Gigaba gave SAA in September may have been unlawful.

It had requested a legal opinion after the DA accused Gigaba of trying to sidestep parliamentary scrutiny by invoking Section 16 of the Public Finance Management Act to help SAA meet its debt payments.

DA deputy finance spokesperson Alf Lees said the minister should have submitted a special appropriations Bill instead of extending an 11th hour bailout, as it was foreseeable SAA would not have the R1.8bn needed to honour its loan agreement.

The committee agreed that a Special Appropriations Bill would have been the correct option, but said ultimately it was up to the auditorgeneral to rule on the legality of Gigaba's use of Section 16.

It stressed that the legal opinion noted the section could be invoked where "good financial planning and management could not avert the need for exceptional or unusual expenditure".

And it added that there had been a clear need to come to SAA's rescue as a default would have had dire consequences.

CAPE TOWN – Incoming Energy Minister David Mahlobo yesterday high-lighted his vision for South Africa's nuclear energy future, following the approval for Eskom to develop 4GW of new power stations near Koeberg last week.

Mahlobo is the third energy minister this year. Tina Joemat-Pettersson was axed in March after the nuclear programme was halted following a court ruling. Her successor, Mmamoloko Kubayi, was this week redeployed to the communications ministry, with speculation that President Jacob Zuma was not happy with her progress in restarting the nuclear procurement programme.

Critics and opposition parties have warned that Mahlobo's appointment could be an attempt by Zuma to push through the nuclear deal,

as the president's leadership position hangs in the balance, ahead of the ANC's elective conference in December.

His appointment comes as the Department of Environmental Affairs (DEA) last week authorised its Final Environmental Impact Report for the power station at Duynefontein, giving Eskom permission to develop a new nuclear plant next to the existing Koeberg power station. Koeberg, based outside Cape

Town, is Africa's only nuclear power station and contributes 6%, or 1.8GW, to South Africa's power grid.

Citing the outdated 2010 Integrated Resource Plan (IRP), which states that South Africa requires 9.6GW of nuclear energy before 2030,

Mahlobo said the latest development forms part of a "policy decision to pursue nuclear energy as a baseload energy form to mitigate our carbon footprint".

"South Africa recognises the role of nuclear power in ensuring security of energy supply and meeting the challenge of climate change," he said. "South Africa has made a policy decision to pursue nuclear energy as part of the energy mix and recognise the role of nuclear as a base-load source of energy in ensuring security of supply and climate change mitigation."

A new IRP has been promised by the end of 2017 or the beginning of 2018. The draft IRP delayed developing any nuclear energy until 2037, but there is speculation the final policy could bring nuclear back in as a requirement.

BLADE'S AXING PUTS STRAIN ON ALLIANCE

DURBAN - President Jacob Zuma had to fire Higher Education Minister Blade Nzimande because of the hostile relationship that had developed between them, said political analyst Dr Bheki Mngomezulu.

Mngomezulu was responding to Zuma's decision to remove Nzimande, the SACP general secretary, from the Cabinet on Tuesday.

Nzimande has been replaced by Hlengiwe Mkhize, the former minister of home affairs. Outraged SACP members described the reshuffle as nothing more than the targeting of Nzimande in an attempt to embarrass the SACP.

Nzimande had joined his colleagues within the SACP and COSATU in the call for Zuma to step down amid allegations of state capture and links to the Gupta family. "It means that there was no element of trust between the two. Therefore it would have been difficult for them to continue working together," said Mngomezulu.

He said the fact that the SACP had endorsed Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa to be elected ANC president instead of Zuma's favoured candidate, Nkosazana Dlamini Zuma, had also contributed to Nzimande's removal. Ramaphosa and Dlamini-Zuma are

the front runners in the presidential race to be decided at the December conference. "Zuma knows that the SACP had taken a formal position on Cyril Ramaphosa," he said.

He said the removal of Nzimande would further divide the relationship within the alliance and within the ANC, as there are members of the ruling party's national executive committee who are angry with Zuma's decision.

ANC Secretary-General Gwede Mantashe tweeted on Tuesday: "Alliance relations are at their lowest.'

Mngomezulu said the national conference might restore the relationship.

"If people are disgruntled after the conference then there will be more divisions," said Mngomezulu.

Daniel Silke, Director of the Cape Town-based Political Futures Consultancy, said Zuma, by firing Nzimande, was taking "incremental action against those who have differed with him". He said the Cabinet included ministers who were deadwood in terms of their performance but they hadn't been removed because of their loyalty to Zuma. Daily News

But race officials have refused to name the musher involved. Several dogs tested positive for the opioid pain reliever Tramadol, the governing board of the nearly 1 600 km Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race said in a statement. The team was tested six hours after finishing the race in Nome in March, officials said. They estimate the drug could have been administered between 15 hours before the test and right before it. If convicted, she faces up to ten years in jail.

MAY TO URGE EU LEADERS TO SPEED UP BREXIT TALKS

BRUSSELS - British Prime Minister Theresa May will appeal to European Union leaders at a crunch summit in Brussels yesterday to push forward the deadlocked Brexit negotiations.

At a meeting moved to a new venue at the last minute due to an eruption of toxic gas, May will urge her colleagues to start looking now at a future trade deal and a transition period after Britain leaves in 2019.

The EU says that there is insufficient progress on divorce issues to move on to the next phase dealing with future relations at this summit, but that it will start internal preparations to do so in December.

May will "encourage them to move the conversation on to consider the future partnership and the implementation period, so that they are

ready to engage in that discussion as soon as possible", a senior British government official said.

May also published a letter on her Facebook page promising to make it as easy as possible for EU citizens to stay in the UK after Brexit. The British official said a deal on citizens' rights was "within touching distance."



SOMALI PRESIDENT VOWS **WAR ON SHABAAB**



Protesters wearing red bands around their heads marched through the scene of the truck bombing, a once bustling district, before gathering at a stadrum where they chanted: "We are ready to fight".

Residents of the Somali capital, while wearily accustomed to regular bombs and attacks by the Islamist militants, have been outraged by the strike on Saturday which left at least 276 dead and 300 wounded.

There has been no immediate claim of responsibility, but the Shabaab, a militant group aligned with Al-Qaeda, carries out regular suicide bombings in Mogadishu in its bid to overthrow Somalia's internationally-backed government.

The president, better known by

his nickname Farmajo, said the attack "shows that we have not done enough to stop Shabaab".

"If we don't respond to this now, the time will surely come when pieces of flesh from all of us are being picked up off the ground. We need to stand up together and fight al-Shabaab who continue massacring our people," he said.

This was revealed by Chadema national Chairman Freeman Mbowe yesterday at a press conference held at the party's headquarters. Mbowe said Lissu, who is also the President of the Tanganyika Law Society, came out of the ICU last week. Mbowe said that the fire brand lawmaker and a great critic of the government was no longer on life supporting machines, but was now temporarily bound to a wheel chair.

UN chief pushes for extra peacekeepers in Central Africa

UNITED NATIONS - Amid a US push to cut costs for United Nations peacekeeping, Secretary-General Antonio Guterres said on Wednesday he hoped the UN Security Council would agree to send an extra 900 troops to protect civilians in Central African Republic (CAR).

Guterres, who will visit CAR next week, told reporters that while peacekeepers had "helped avert the worst" when mass atrocities were being committed in the country five years ago, the situation remained "very troubling."

"Across the country, communal tensions are growing. Violence is spreading, the humanitarian situation is deteriorating, there is a need to increase the capacity of our troops in Central African Republic to protect civilians," Guterres said.

"I am convinced there will be a very positive understanding of all the members of the Security Council, including the United States of America, in relation to this," he

Thousands died and a fifth of Central Africans fled a conflict that broke out after mainly Muslim Seleka rebels ousted President Francois Bozize in 2013, provoking a backlash from Christian anti-balaka militias.

Although unrest has since subsided, fighting spiked this year and the United Nations warned that ethnic fighting could descend again into a much larger conflict.

UN peacekeepers were deployed in 2014 and the Security Council is due to renew the mandate for the mission of more than 12 000 troops and police by mid-November. In a report to the council on Tuesday, Guterres recommended an extra 900 troops.

US Ambassador Nikki Haley led a push to cut peacekeeping costs and is reviewing each operation as annual mandates come up for renewal by the Security Council. President Donald Trump wants to cap the US share of the peacekeeping bill at 25 per cent, down from 28.5 per cent, a level he said is "unfair."

MOGADISHU - Allies sent planes to Somalia making it the worst attack in a country that has carrying medical supplies and doctors on Tuesday, while the diaspora rallied to donate blood to help cope with the crushing aftermath of the country's worst bombing.

Medical sources suggest the death toll could be over 300, although the government's official total is 276 people killed and 300 injured after a truck blew up in a busy commercial district of the capital on Saturday.

It was said to be carrying 500kg of explosives,

There has been widespread criticism on social media that the disaster has not been more extensively covered by media and that people have not reached out to to the Somalis with as much sympathy and solidarity as after terrorist attacks in other cities, particularly in the West. AFP

SOCHI-Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe, 93, is reportedly set to be honoured by African youths and students attending the 19th youth festival held in Sochi, Russia for "championing the fight against imperialism".

According to the state-owned Herald newspaper, African youths at the festival had set aside a day to celebrate Mugabe "for his determined stand against imperia-

The event, said the report, would run under the theme: "President Robert Mugabe: The champion of land redistribution and total restoration of natural resources from imperialists to the African masses".

ZANU-PF youth leader, Kudzanai Chipanga, who was also attending the festival, described

the nonagenarian as a "revolutionary leader" who was in the forefront in fighting for "economic emancipation of both Zimbabweans and Africans".

This, Chipanga said had been manifested through the country's often chaotic land reform programme, which according to him "has made Zimbabwe one of the only countries on the continent to restore land to its

rightful owners, the indigenes". ANC Youth League General Secretary, Njabulo Nzuza con-

curred, and praised the Zimbabwean leader whom he described as a "living example of leadership that Africa needs to move forward". Nzuza challenged the African

youth to be proactive in discussing the continents politics and economics. According to reports last week, Mugabe was expected to speak at the festival alongside his Russian counterpart President Vladimir Putin.

However, reports emerged over the weekend that Mugabe was instead set to attend a World Health Organisation (WHO) conference in Uruguay, while heading to Russia for the youth festival. News24

Liberian rebel commander guilty of immigration fraud

PHILADELPHIA - A Liberian accused of war crimes has been convicted of lying about his past as a rebel commander so he could enter the US.

51-year-old Mohammed Jabbateh was found guilty in a federal court in Philadelphia of immigration fraud and perjury

for deceiving US officials about his role during the Liberian civil war in the 1990s.

His trial involved testimony from several witnesses who said he or his soldiers killed civilians, raped women and engaged in cannibalism. He was known during the war as Jungle Jabbah.

Jabbateh has maintained his innocence. His attorney says that prosecutors were "hoodwinked" by the witnesses' "tall tales."

He has been living in the US for about two decades and was arrested last year outside Philadelphia.

"The reason we are having the two beauty pageants early next year is because we want to be ready for the international competition by year end," she added. The committee that was supposed to run the project was formally introduced to the public early this year; in May to be precise and they had promised to revive the beauty pageant but they failed due to unforeseen circumstances. The PRO of the pageant Thembekile Magongo was the first one to resign and a month later she was followed by the Director Nosisa Maziya.

ACASWA amending law to protect gospel artists

THE Association of Christian Artists in Swaziland (ACASWA) is not taking lightly the issue of South African artists allegedly 'stealing' musical compositions and presenting them as their own.

The custodians of gospel music in the country are currently in a mission to amend their constitution to include a section that will allow the association to take action on behalf of the artists.

Vice President Terrence Matse said they were very concerned about the growing trend where by foreign artists take songs from local artists and record them for commercial purposes, without even the consent of the composers.

Great

He said this is of great concern to them as an association, but noted that currently the constitution does not empower them to protect the artists in this regard.

"We do not have a problem if an artist loves the song and performs it or even a church choir performs the song during services but when they go to the extent of recording the composition and get financial gain out someone's intellectual property, it is very disturbing.

The sad part is that a number of songs have been recorded by a number of reputable artists and groups and do not even attribute to the owner of the work," he said

"We will have a meeting on Sunday where we will discuss this issue further and adopt a few amendments in our constitution, which will allow the association to take action on behalf of the artists because it is illegal.

Artists have copyright to their work and need to be protected," said Matse.

A number of local composition have been reproduced by South African artists, songs like 'Udekitafula' composed by Frans Dlamini, compositions by Reverend Elias Shongwe of Shongwe and Khuphuka Saved Group 'Amazulu avumile and 'Kub'Inkosi Moya Ongcwele,' a composition by Phetsile Masilela and recently that of Gcina Masuku were all reproduced and recorded by South African groups.

He said this is one of the many challenges the incoming executive will have to deal with when they assume office as the current term of office for them has expired.

Matse also invited all their members to the annual general meeting slated for next Sunday.

He said during the meeting, members are expected to finalise the amendment of the constitution and also elect a new committee, among other things on the agenda.

Matse said the meeting, which is expected to start at 2 pm, will also give members a financial report by the treasurer and the remarks by the outgoing President Zakhele Ginindza.

He said the Ginindza-led outgoing committee has achieved a lot during their term of office, citing the two Gospel Music Awards events of 2014 and 2016 they hosted through which the biggest prizes were vehicles in both events.

He also noted that they also hosted a successful crossover in Shiselweni cross over event dubbed 'Uvukile Festival', Amadodana Competition and the ACASWA national prayers 2016 and 2017, among other events.

Finalising

"We are currently finalising the Constitutional Review which we hope the incoming executive will take over and implement the amendments.

We also pushed the Copyright Bill, which has eventually been passed in both chambers of the Parliament, we also maintained good working relations with the Swaziland International Trade Fair and also hosted two artists workshops as well as put in place regional committees which makes work easy for the main committee," he added.

Conte hits back at Mou over injury jibe

LONDON - Antonio Conte warned Jose Mourinho to stop talking about Chelsea after the Manchester United boss criticised managers who complain about injuries.

Defending United's cautious tactics in last weekend's draw at Liverpool and Wednesday's 1-0 win over Benfica, Mourinho made it clear he had opted for a conservative approach because his side are missing key players.

But Mourinho insisted that wasn't making excuses, a charge he believes others are guilty of in the Premier League. Chelsea boss Conte has repeatedly mentioned his team's injury problems during their current winless run, which extended to three matches after they were held to a 3-3 draw by Roma on Wednesday. Conte is without N'Golo Kante, Victor Moses and Danny Drinkwater, while Alvaro Morata has just returned to fitness.

"I never speak about injuries. Other managers, they cry, they cry, they cry when a player is injured," Mourinho said after the win in Benfica.

"If I wanted to moan and others I could cry like the others for five minutes; Ibrahimovic, Fellaini, Pogba,

Rojo."

Told of Mourinho's comments by a journalist, Conte asked if they were aimed at him.

When the response was yes, Conte visibly bristled before angrily telling former Chelsea boss Mourinho to mind his own business.

"If this is for me my answer is this—he has to think of his team and look at himself not the others," Conte said.

"A lot of times Mourinho has to see what happened in Chelsea. Also last season. He has to look at his team." Appleton is in charge of firstteam affairs at the King Power Stadium while the Srivaddhanaprabha family search

MESSI JOINS 100 GOAL **CLUB IN EUROPE**

BARCELONA - Lionel Messi scored his 100th goal in European competition as Barcelona moved close to qualifying for the Champions League knockout stages by outclassing Olympiakos 3-1 on Wednesday despite playing the entire second half with 10 men.

Gerard Pique was sent off two minutes before halftime for two bookings, one for tugging an opponent's shirt and the other for slapping the ball into the net, but Barca were barely threatened by a hapless Olympiakos side who are badly underperforming in their Greek title defence.

The Athens club, who won three league titles and two domestic Cups under current Barca coach Ernesto Valverde, are

fifth in the standings in the Greek top flight and have lost all their games in the Champions League.

Barca took the lead in the 18th minute on a rainswept evening at a sparsely attended Nou Camp when vis-

iting defender Dimitrios Nikolaou turned Gerard Deulofeu's cross into his own net.

It was the fifth own goal Barca have benefited from this season in all competitions. Messi struck his

landmark goal in Europe from a free kick in the 61st minute to double Barca's lead. It was his 97th goal the

Champions

while his other three strikes in Europe came in the UEFA Super Cup.

The Argentine then carved his way through the hapless visiting defence moments later to tee up France left back Lucas Digne to score his first goal in the Champions League for Barca. Greek defender Nikolaou put the ball in the net for the second time in the game by heading home from a corner at the other end to give Olympiakos a scantlydeserved consolation goal in the 89th minute. Barca top Champions League Group D with nine points after winning their first three games and are six ahead of Juventus. A win at Olympiakos in two weeks will seal their place in the last 16. "We are feeling very good in the league and Champions League and we have to keep going like this," Barca's Sergi Roberto told reporters after his side recorded a 10th victory in 11 games.

"We are frustrated to have conceded a goal although by then the game was

Juve snatch late win v Sporting

MILAN - Juventus rallied from a bizarre Alex Sandro own goal to battle past Sporting Lisbon 2-1 on Wednesday and move second behind Barcelona in Champions League Group D.

The Portuguese visitors surged ahead after 12 minutes in the Allianz Stadium when the ball accidentally bounced off the Brazilian left-back and into his own

net after Gianluigi Buffon had saved from Gelson Martins.

But Bosnian midfielder Miralem Pjanic hauled the hosts back into the game after 29 minutes before Croatian forward Mario Mandzukic headed in the winner six minutes from time.

Juventus - who lost their opening game 3-0 to Barcelona but beat Olympiakos 2-0 with late goals - are second in Group D behind the Spaniards with six points from three games. Sporting are now third.

"It was a tough game, and an important win," said Juventus defender Giorgio Chiellini.

"The important thing was not to concede goals but we didn't dwell on it (the own goal), we showed personality."

It was a first win for the Turin club since their victory over Olympiakos as they have been frustrated in Serie A recently.

Italian title-winners in the last six seasons, Juventus lost to Lazio on Saturday - a first home


defeat in over two years after being held by Atalanta the previous week.

But they looked to be struggling for form again as they were pushed hard in Turin by a Portuguese side chasing a first win in

Pjanic - returning after almost a month out with a thigh problem - partnered Sami Khedira in midfield with Blaise Matuidi rested.

After the unfortunate own goal, Gonzalo Higuain's close-range shot five minutes later was blocked before Rui Patricio dived to keep out a Khedira effort.

Mbappe highest scoring teenager in Champions League history

PARIS - Kylian Mbappe continues to smash records.

On Wednesday night, the Paris Saint-Germain forward became the highest scoring teenager in Champions League history, notching his eighth goal in just 12 games in the competition against Anderlecht.

It was his second goal in the Champions League this season, adding to the six he scored in Monaco's unlikely run to the semi-finals last season.

The goal sees him surpass Patrick Kluivert's 21-year-old record.

The Dutch striker scored seven Champions League goals in two full seasons for Ajax before his 20th birthday, including a famous late winner over AC Milan in the 1995 final.

Frenchman Mbappe is in no immediate danger of being caught either. No teenager currently playing has scored more than the two goals which Marcus Rashford has.

And the Manchester United forward, who scored the winner against Benfica on Wednesday night, turns 20 on the day of his side's next European game so has no chance to add to his tally of two in three. Mbappe's PSG team-mate Goncalo Guedes - currently on loan at Valencia - makes the top 10 with three goals but is approaching his 21st birthday.






