THIS week should be an exciting week—it is the week that the liberalisation of the mobile telecommunications comes to reality.

The anticipated launch of the second mobile operator, Swazi Mobile at the end of this week should bring to an end a monopoly enjoyed by Swazi MTN while also bringing relief to customers who have been desperate for a competitive mobile communications industry.

When the market opens up later this month, it will herald a whole new era for consumers, who have waited 10 years for this industry to open up.

Finally there will be competition between the mobile networks; tariffs will be cheaper and affordable; and generally, the telecommunications industry will finally come to life.

This will boost a lot of other areas, such as business; the ease and cheaper communication should ensure that businesses are not paying too much for communication, while many will probably access other opportunities to boost the economy. This should have happened a long time ago, of course, but, it is also about the now and the future we will concern ourselves with. The industry needs the vibrancy of competition, for a monopoly is never good for the growth of a nation. This move therefore is a welcome relief to everyone, and should allow Swazi MTN to stake its claim as the biggest network provider in the kingdom.

Admittedly, the competition comes in the form of a local company as opposed to an international brand, the likes that the nation was hoping for before the process of awarding the operating licence was official launched.

However, Swazi Mobile might be a local company, but they have already indicated that they will be no pushovers. The company has recruited well; it has so far demonstrated its capability to deliver on the services. It has thus far whet the appetite of the public through its promotions—the sponsoring of the inter-

national matches at Somhlolo. Swazi Mobile has announced that it is here to play big, not small, and this should be music to the ears of everyone who has a cellphone—or two. Generally, the future is in the ICT. The competition in the mobile networks is a good tonic for our poor economy, and definitely what the public needs to keep the cost of communication low. Hopefully, the data fees will fall.

The public is therefore waiting for Swazi Mobile, with bated breath. The public cannot wait for the games to begin. From what we have seen so far, kusetoba mnandzi!

PRINCESS SEEKS TO REPORT CJ OVER LAND ISSUE

PRINCESS Ngebeti made her sixth trip to the Mbangweni Umphakatsi on Saturday, and once again, it was another exercise in futility.

The princess, accompanied by her first born son Makhosemvelo Mnisi, left the *umphakatsi* feeling dejected after failing to reach conclusion over the ownership over a piece of land that Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala also chains ownership of.

She and her son have now resolved to take title and matter to the highest authority.

"Sale sivunyelwa siyobika CJ kulabafanele kutsi ujame emhlabeni waketfu ngenkhani," concluded Mnisi at the end of their meeting with the elders. When loosely translated, this means they now wish to escalate the matter to authorities of the land and report Maphalala for refusing to bring back the land.

Princess Ngebeti is the widow of former foreign affairs minister Mhambi Mnisi. She made another trip on Saturday to request the *umphakatsi* to p advise Maphalala to move out of her land.

Makhosemvelo Mnisi is reportedly the only person Maphalala had said he would be willing to engage with on the matter. He was in no compromising mood when meeting the *Umphakatsi* headman as he made it clear that as much as Mhambi Mnisi was his father, the fact that he had married a member of the royal family, the land in question automatically was owned by royalty.


He explained that it was a known arrangement that anyone marrying a princess, the household is then referred to as 'Kamntfwanenkhosi'. He said it was what happened when his late father and the princess built the homestead at Ngwabi.

"She is demanding what is rightfully hers. For the whole judge to contest something which he knows he does not own, I think it unfortunate. Why is my mother being frustrated when she is not even supposed to beg that this person should vacate that land? Why is it taking ages for elders of this *umphakatsi* to act? Do they want to see the princess frustrated? Let us be allowed to seek audience elsewhere if *umphakatsi* does not have a solution," said Mnisi.

He further questioned the decision of the elders of *umphakatsi* to visit the CJ at his workplace instead of summoning him to the *umphakatsi*. He said it should be known that Maphalala was only a CJ when doing his office work but on issues such as this one he remained an ordinary resident or citizen of the land. He said it was unfair to see the *umphakatsi* authorities driving all the way to Mbabane to meet the CJ over a

matter at community level.

"It's not different that *umphakatsi* decided to pay a courtesy call for on a suspect. They should have summoned him here at *umphakatsi*. They seemed to be worshipping him while on the other hand the Princess is given a raw deal. It's her sixth trip today but still *umphakatsi* seems to be not bothered. The excuse they are giving today is that Maphalala cannot come and here and they don't care about the frustration the princess is going through. It's her land and she now wants it without conditions," he complained.

Allowed

He further added that it was not going to happen that Maphalala would be allowed to remain on the land as whatever agreement he had with the late Mnisi was not known to the family, in particular the princess.

"That he can be allowed to grab that land just for a cow he claimed to have forwarded, that is not going to happen. We are talking of over five hectares of land and for someone to have it for one cow, it's unbelievable. He should just move out peacefully before he gets embarrassed," he continued.

Mnisi also raised a concern on why those advocating for rights of widows and other victims where land was grabbed anyhow were quiet on this matter involving the princess.

"Where are the women who should be sympathising with the princess? Does it mean she does not deserve the sympathy which is at times given to others who find themselves in such situations?

It's a widow we are talking about having what she sweated for grabbed by a man who should be exemplary in society given the position he is holding," said Mnisi. He then wondered why the leadership in the Judiciary was not advising the CJ of the embarrassment this could end up causing to him if he keeps clinging on what he knew deep down his heart that it does not belong to him. "There is need that he is advised to leave the land in peace.

Bodies

The Judicial Service Commission is quiet, Parliament is quiet and even the bodies or organisations which are vocal on such matters touching widows all are silent," said Makhosemvelo.

Meanwhile, Mbangweni *Umphakatsi* Indvuna Peter Mamba, who had a hectic time as he was grilled by Mnisi, said he had communicated to the family that it was not going to be possible to have the issue deliberated on Saturday. He said he had called the family to alert them that they should not bother to come as the CJ was not going to make it.

"On top of that, today (Saturday) we had an important event where the Shiselweni Forestry Company (SFC) had come to educate the community about forest fires and other things. It was not going to be possible to have the matter discussed when on the other hand we were also involved in the event," said Mamba.

Princess Ngebeti is expected to return to the *umphakatsi* this coming Saturday as per agreement of all parties. It's going to be the princess seventh trip to Mbangweni to seek help from the authorities to seek their help in kicking out the CJ from her land.

Once again efforts to contact the chief justice failed as his phone rang unanswered. The last attempt was made yesterday with his number eventually not available on the network.

BENNETT FEELS NGEBETI IS UNFAIRLY TREATED

"THERE is no way land can be allocated to two people and if there is anything like that, there is something amiss."

This is the view of Walter Bennett regarding the disput between the CJ and Princess Ngebeti.

Worrying

Bennett said it was also worrying as to why the CJ preferred to have the princess son Makhosemvelo to be the one he wanted to talk to when the owner of the land was the princess.

"As to why the CJ wants to talk to the princess son when she is still alive, that also raises questions," said Bennett, when his views were sought by the newspaper. Umngani we-Makhosi Timothy Velabo Mtetwa on the other hand, did not want to say anything, stating that such a matter has still not been reported to him.

DON'T GIVE THE DEVIL A CHANCE - KING

HIS Majesty King Mswati III has urged the Swazi nation not to give the devil a chance in their lives, so that the country may experience revival and restoration.

The King was speaking through Prince Simelane at the Somhlolo Festival of Praise 2017, which was held at the National Church in Lobamb yesterday.

The church service was attended by royalty, Cabinet ministers, senior government officials, pastors and bishops from a number of churches around the coun-

This year's Somhlolo Festival of Praise was under the theme 'Vision for national revival and restoration'. The church service started on Wednesday with a symposium which was held at the King Sobhuza II Memorial Park on Saturday, a national prayer breakfast was held at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre.

His Majesty King Mswati III urged the nation to give themselves back to God, and live according to the ways of the Bible, abandon sin and live righteously so that the devil does not get a chance in their lives. He referred the congregation to Ephesians 4 verse 27, which states that 'do not give a chance to the devil'.

"You must live your lives in the truth

of God, you must make sure that you do not give the devil a chance in your life," he said. He made an example of four scenarios in the Bible where people gave the devil a chance in their lives and the end was not so good.

"What will it profit you to gain the whole world but at the end lose your life and the Kingdom of God? ", he said.

The King further said Swaziland is one of the two countries in the world where God showed Himself. He said first it was in Israel where God showed Himself to Moses and secondly it was in Swaziland where God showed himself to King Somhlolo. He said this resulted in Swaziland being named the 'pulpit of Swaziland'.

Prince Simelane further said the King has the promised to live by the promise he made to the nation during his coronation, which is to lead Swaziland the way King Sobhuza II led the country, which is by putting God first in everything. "Swaziland's hope lies in God, He watches over the nation and protects us. As per media reports, there is a lot of unease in the rest of Africa and the world but Swaziland has remained peaceful. What can Swaziland do to thank God for this protection? As a nation, we need to repent and give ourselves to God. This is the only thing that will please God," His Majesty said.

needs revival

REVEREND Victor Dlamini of Mahamba Methodist said Swaziland needs a revival as it is the key to the revival of the whole of Africa.

Reverend Dlamini said that as Swaziland is the pulpit of Africa, it needs to be exemplary. He said in the meantime, Swaziland can be likened to be suffering from 'umdlopha' which is commonly known as Mastitis. "With Swaziland being the mother to the rest of Africa, with its status of being the pulpit of Africa, Swaziland having 'umdlopha'

means the rest of Africa will suffer. Swaziland needs to go back to its original position so that the rest of Africa can fall back into its place. The solution lies in the Bible and living according to it statutes," he said.

Surrender

The reverend said Swaziland needs to surrender to God, so that all may go well for the country.

He further stated that the KM III International Airport is a prophetic building as it will be host to many nations who will be coming to the country, as Swaziland is the pulpit of Africa. "This may not happen today or tomorrow but the airport will witness throngs of people coming in through to it. This generation may not witness it but the following generation will definitely see this," he said.

Umgijimi gets 15 years for rape of teen

A former trusted aide of Inkhosatana Gelane Zwane has been sent to jail for 15 years for rape.

The trusted servant in the community of KoNtshingila was found guilty of the rape of a minor, who it is believed is related to him and had turned him into a sex slave.

Zwane is the acting chief of KoNtshingila but her stronghold is KaGwegwe.

The 52-year - old was Umgijimi during the time when well known of Hlatikulu resident Mfeneziyamtfoba Magagula was still Indvuna. He has been convicted for sleeping with the teenage at girl for over three years after he was exposed by the community members who had threatened to attack him.

He was only arrested after residents of the area resolved they would no longer sit by and watch as he continued to have his way with the teenager. Close relatives were aware of the matter but because others feared what would happen to them if they took the issue up with the relevant authorities, they were reluctant to confront him.

A plan was eventually made to alert the police and it was only then that investigations were carried out, leading to his arrest on Friday.

The survivor is said to have fallen victim to the man because she is on medication and each time she had to take her medication, she had to go into his bedroom and that would be when he would start fondling her and forcing himself on her.

"Her medication was kept in the main bedroom and each time she needed to take it, she would

go there. It would be then that the accused would rape her," said a source.

Principal Magistrate Florence Msibi stated that the accused had committed a serious crime which was unforgiveable. The accused told the court he had realised that he committed a serious crime but claimed it was a mistake and regretted what he had done to the little girl.

Having pleaded guilty, he was then sentenced to 15 years in jail. He conducted his own defence while representing the Crown was Patty Hlophe.

Residents

Meanwhile, some of the residents of Sibetsamoya, including Magagula, said they were also taken aback by what happened. Magagula has blamed some of the residents and close relatives who were keeping this matter a secret even when they were aware of the structures they were supposed to report it to.

"It's good that the law has taken its cause but at the same time residents are to blame as they could have reported such a matter long time as I am told he started sleeping with the girl many years ago. Maybe it would have not gone this far had they reported it early," said Magagula, who also acknowledged that he worked with the accused while he was still Indvuna before his unceremonious removal.

On the other hand, senior Indvuna of KoNtshingila Mageza Mazibuko said the accused was no longer umgijimi of the area as he was removed together with Magagula and a new team put in place.

"He was removed along with those who were with Magagula," said Mazibuko.

Inkhosatana Gelane, on the other hand, said she was not aware of the incident but she was quick to condemn it.

Using the right light bulbs can be your first step in your efforts to save electricity

Do bu know lighting accounts for 10%-30% of a typical household's by bill in India? PILE-UP KOMBI DRIVER FINED FOR DRINK-DRIVING

THE driver of the kombi who was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol during the seven-car-pile up at KaKhoza, has been fined E3 000 for his troubles.

The driver, who has been identified as Samkelo Mkhatshwa (31) of Madonsa was charged with two offences, one being drink-driving and driving an un-roadworthy vehicle.

He appeared at the Manzini Magistrate's Court yesterday. Mkhatshwa was arrested by the police for being found driving under the influence of alcohol on Saturday while at KaKhoza public road.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Assistant Superintendent Vilakati confirmed the matter.

"Police arrested one driver for reckless driving as he was driving under the influence of alcohol," she said.

Vilakati mentioned that the suspect appeared at Manzini Magistrate Court yesterday. The seven-car pile-up at KaKhoza caused major delays for people rushing to attend the country's fast growing commemoration of Somhlolo Day and the

Biggest Braai.

In our sister newspaper the Sunday Observer, it was reported that accident occurred after 11am when a Honda SUV rammed into a stationary Nissan March sedan.

Pile-up

Thereafter, there was more pandemonium as five more vehicles, one after the other, rear-ended one after the other, resulting in the pile-up.

It is alleged the cars were travelling at high speed on the fast lane and they failed to brake on time.

Most of the cars got involved in the accident as they tried to avoid the two cars that caused the accident.

"It is difficult to apply emergency brakes when on the fast lane, which is why in most cases cars that collide on the fast lane, usually cause fatal accidents," said the eyewitness.

There were no serious injuries reported, according to police officers who attended to the scene.

Another witness who was shocked said he was overtaken by the last vehicle in the pileup, a Chevrolet at Mhlaleni, only to meet up with it on the scene.

One of the victims said he did not see it coming, hence he could not brake on time as he was on the fast lane, which is meant for moving cars. The victim said he was not expecting to find cars that have collided which were the main cause of the accident.

EMPLOYEES of Hurlingham Estate will be smiling all the way to the bank as the Swaziland Transport and Allied Workers Union (STAWU) has secured a one year collective bargaining agreement (CBA) with the company that will see employees receiving a 41.6 per cent pay rise and two months back payment.

The maiden CBA agreement was signed by STAWU National Coordinator Sticks Nkambule early this month.

According to a statement released by Nkambule, STAWU engaged and subsequently signed a one year collective bargaining agreement (CBA) on July 12 with Hurlingham Estate (HE).

Nkambule stated that the said agreement granted the lowest earning worker a 41.6 per cent pay raise and a highest earning worker got 15.6 per cent pay rise in respect of basic monthly earnings. Among other material terms of the agreement, the national coordinator stated that the parties agreed to conduct a scientific job grading process which shall formulate and recommend application of an equitable pay structure by May 2018.

Provision

He said the CBA became effective from May 1, 2017 which invariably makes provision for two months back pay. Hurlingham Estate is an entity that grows, harvest and transport cane in the sugar-belt with its operation base being Mhlume in Swaziland.

Nkambule added that Hurlingham

Estate emplyees form a newly established branch of STAWU whose relationship and recognition agreement has been concluded and signed by STAWU and HE. "To this end, we find it worth mentioning that this maiden collective bargaining agreement has been negotiated and signed in two sittings," Nkambule stated. Nkambule, who facilitated the negotiations of both agreements, further commented; "We congratulate HE for demonstrating an uncommon ability to listen to its workers. Such conduct is a desirous bedrock feature we need in such a relationship." Swaziland Transport and Allied Workers Union (STAWU) is a trade union formation affiliated to Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) locally and globally affiliated to the International Transport Workers Federation (ITF).

Man crushed to death by truck door

A young aspiring mechanic died painfully when he was crushed by a back-tail door of a tipper truck at popular Nhlangano businessman Jika Ndlangamandla's workshop.

Mnqedisi Mkhonta, aged 24, was died on Saturday morning.

Ndlangamandla is a popular figure in the transport industry and owns a fleet of Jika Majika buses and trucks. Jika Majika's Workshop is at the Nhlangano Industrial Site.

Jika is the Chairperson of the bus and truck association in the Shiselweni region.

The young man, who was on an attachment as he was still waiting to return to a college where he had enrolled for a mechanic qualification, was with other employees when the back-tail door fell on his head, killing him instantly.

According to reports the truck was offloading when the back tail door somehow accidentally loosened and upon realising the danger others managed to retreat but for Mkhonta it was too late. He was caught even before he could take any step. It was a sad experience for everyone as others openly wept.

Occurred

Jika Ndlangamandla, who was also present when the tragedy occurred, said he was still in pain over incident. He said the young man was among many others who he assisted each time they wanted to gain experience while waiting to return to their training institutions.

"I always allow some of these students to gain experience and if I am not mistaken the deceased arrived here almost two or three weeks ago to be an intern. I am struggling to come to terms regarding still this tragedy.

There were at least eight of us who were assisting in offloading the truck and it was while we were doing this when the door loosened; we noticed this and alerted everyone the deceased was unfortunately not made aware in time and it crushed him. It's a sad thing and we are still unable to cope with what has taken place," said Ndlangamandla, in an interview yesterday at his workshop.

He said what befell him was thing he would never forget and was also worried as to why such an incident happened at his place of business.

The businessman said he was also devastated to learn that he was related to the deceased."That's something I only got to know today. His mother's surname is Ndlangamandla, I was told we share close ties with his mother's family," said Ndlangamandla.

Acting Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent PhindileVilakati confirmed the tragedy, saying police were still conducting their investigations.

D9 DRINK-DRIVERS ARRESTED

THERE were 109 cases of drinkdriving reported over the past weekend.

Acting Chief Information and

Communications Officer Assistant Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed this figure yesterday.

Some of the offenders have appeared in courts for the offence while others will appear today in various courts of in the country.

"There were 109 drink-driving cases

reported over the past weekend while the previous one we registered 96 cases," said Vilakati.

Though Vilakati could not be drawn to comment on the reason for the increase in cases past weekend, it is suspected that it has to do with the weekend being the first one after some people received their salaries.

The past weekend also saw interesting events being held in the country including the Biggest Braai held in Manzini which saw a number of people in attendance.

Vilakati urged the public to drink responsibly and not to get behind the wheel after drinking any alcoholic beverage. Driving whilst under the influence not only poses a danger to the driver but to other motories t on the road. "Many of the accidents on our roads are caused by drink driving. We therefore advice people to use taxis or get a sober drive when driving home after a drinking spree."

Furthermore, she advised the public not to drink excessively and forget to obey the laws of the country as the Royal Swaziland Police will arrest

Drunk offender drives crying child to mom

Stories by Mbono Mdluli Mbabane Magistrate's Court

A drink-driving offender did not only risk his life by driving under the influence of alcohol, but also that of his child.

Sibusiso Gamedze was nabbed by police driving in the company of his child whilst under the influence of alcohol yesterday at Nkoyoyo,

Gamedze appeared before Mbabane Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi yesterday to answer for his offence. The alcohol in his body was recoreded 0.58 milligrams per litre.

The offender's rights to representation were explained to him and he opted to conduct his own defence. When the charge was read to him he said he understood it.

Gamedze was eventually found guilty of driving under the influence of alcohol

"I encountered a situation whereby I was left with a toddler by my wife. She had gone to a funeral at a place not far from where I stay. After she left I started drinking yet I was left with the toddler and other children of mine. The toddler started crying non-stop," Gamedze said, when asked to mitigate.

Gamedze stated that the way the toddler was

crying made him think it needed the mother's attention, hence he decided to drive the toddler to the mother, even though he was drunk. Nhlabatsi could hear none of such.

She did not view it as a genuine excuse, which could guarantee the court's lenience towards Gamedze. She told Gamedze his utterances were not making the situation any better because he was not only risking himself, but the life of the child also.

She asked him to state another reason why the court should be lenient to him. He told the court that he was committing the offence for the first time.

He went on to say he was a family man, who needed to take care of his children, so he was asking for leniency from the court. Nhlabatsi sentenced Gamedze to a period of 15 months in the correctional institution or pay a fine of E1 500.Meanwhile, Sicelo Nkosingiphile Motsa was also found guilty of driving under the influence of alcohol. The alcohol in his body was 0.48 milligrams per litre. He was nabbed by Lobamba police on Saturday at Satellite in Ezulwini. He asked for leniency from the court because he was committing the offence for the first time. Nhlabatsi sentenced him to pay a fine of E1 400 or spend 14 months in a correctional institution.

DD offender doubts his signature

A drink-driving offender yesterday doubted his signature when he was asked if he was the one that signed.

Vusi Mncina was nabbed by Mbabane police on Saturday at Hilltop in Mbabane. At the time of his arrest Mncina was driving a Mercedes-Benz and the content of alcohol in his body was recorded at 0.81mg/l.

Mncina asked to confirm if a breathalyser test was conducted on him. He responded to the affirmative confirmed that it was conducted.

Confirm

He was then asked to confirm if the content of alcohol in his body was shown to him. Normally, traffic police officers require a drink-driving offender to sign to confirm that a test was actually taken. Mncina was shown the piece of paper where the test results were recorded. There was a signature on the piece the fine, he would face spending 18 months of paper.

Mncina was asked to confirm if the signature was his.

Mncina said he could not confirm but the signature resembled his signature.

Mbabane Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi, who was hearing the case, told Mncina that she was asking because she only wanted to find out if he was confirming that the test was

Doubting

Mncina continued doubting his signature. He asked the principal magistrate to continue with the case.

He was eventually found guilty of drink-

He asked for leniency from the court, promising never to do it again. He also asked to be allowed to pay the E1 800 fine on Friday.

Nhlabatsi refused, saying if he failed to pay at a correctional institution.

Two girls jaywalk on highway at Ngwenya

MBABANE Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi yesterday rebuked two young girls for attempting suicide.

Nosimilo Nkambule and Nokwethu Matsenjwa appeared before Principal Magistrate Fikile

Nhlabatsi for jaywalking at Ngwenya. They were appreahended by Mbabane police officer trying to cross the Mbabane-Ngwenya freeway, in a way that could cause accidents to themselves and other road users

They were tried sepa-Nosimilo Nkambule crossed the road while under the influence of alcohol. The alcohol content in her body was 1.11mg/l.

Nkambule was found guilty of committing the offence. She asked for leniency from the court as she did this by mistake. Magistrates Nhlabatsi said she was going to hand her the maximum sentence because what she did was no different form a suicide attempt.

She sentenced her to pay a fine of E800 or face spending a period of eight months in a correctional institution.

Matsenjwa also asked the court to be lenient to her and she promised not to commit the same offence again.

The principal magistrate sentenced Matsenjwa

to pay a fine of E500 or face spending five months in a correctional institution.

Another female was also sentenced to pay a fine of E800 or face spending a period of six months at a correctional institution. was charged for causing an accident at Mvubu, along the Malagwane hill. This happened almost two weeks ago, on July

Nkambule is said to have caused an accident because she was speeding. She was accused of failing to apply brakes on time and and therefore failing to prevent the accident from happening. She asked for leniency from the court as this was happening for the first time in her life. She promised to be very cautious to prevent such from happening in the future.







Deaths


So frustrating was the distances they walked such that some could not made it to the health institution on time. This resulting in unnecessary deaths.

"Since its construction we have received positive comments from beneficiaries," he said.




RELIEF: The Mkhize bridge that has cost government E1.2 million to put up.



GOVT WANTS NEW TRAFFIC FINES IMPLEMENTED SOON

Stories by Lungelo Nkambule Senate

THE proposed new traffic fines as contained in the Road Traffic Regulations 2017 are in line with the times hence they must be implemented as soon as possible.

This was disclosed by Minister of Public Works and Transport Lindiwe Dlamini in Parliament last Thursday, where she was responding to questions posed by senators, following a motion by Senator Ndumiso Mdluli that the regulations be debated.

Minister Dlamini, when responding, said the new traffic regulations were long overdue. She said for a long time, government didn't have enough money to do a feasibility study and draft the regulations, hence the delay. She said



COMESA had come to government's rescue, which is why the country now had the new regulations.

"Considering that the road regulations we are currently using were implemented in 1976 and at that time E60, which is common road fine in the country, was equivalent to a person's salary," the minister said.

Dlamini, further justifying the need for steeper traffic fines, said in the last five years 860 deaths on the roads had been reported. She said the traffic fines were made steep because they were a mechanism to make people follow traffic laws and also curb accidents on the

The minister pointed out that most

accidents on the road were caused by negligence and that was something they were trying to fight with the steep traffic fines.

"People don't have a problem paying E60 anymore and after doing so, they take to the road and do the very thing they were fined for because the fine no longer serves as a deterrent," she said. The minister said some people even budgeted for traffic fines because they had no problem paying

The senators, who were in support of the regulations, questioned why they were made so steep because the people were not the ones who had put them on hold for 41 years. Senator Meninjeni Mahlalela said much as the hike was justified, the fines were a bit too high and from where he was standing, government was now punishing motorists and that was unjustifiable.

"The fines are rather too steep, something that shouldn't be so, they should have been increasing gradually over the years not this moving them from E60 to E2 000; that is a problem," he said. He said that is why people were viewing the fines as punishment rather than a necessary instrument to fight negligence on the roads.

Senator Chief Ngome Ndlangamandla concurred with Mahlalela. He said much as the regulations were of national standard, they mustn't come across as punishment for road users.

"The regulations are of international standard, something we very much appreciate but they must be increased gradually not in this manner," he said.

Princess Phumelele was of the view that the fines must not be standard. She said the fines must vary with the offences and not all fines should be increased as there were some offences that were not serious.

"The fines must vary, there are things like cracked windscreen whose fines shouldn't be increased, because they are not really a danger and half the time, windscreens are cracked by other cars," she said. She said there were those that needed huge fines, like speeding. She further called for the protection of pedestrians from motorists.

She said motorists who knocked down pedestrians must be handed hefty fines that they will pay all their lives, something the minister agreed with.

SADC licences failure a disgrace - Senators

IT is a disgrace that the country had the Southern Africa Development (SADC) chairpersonship but driver's licences are still not compatible with regional dictates on same.

Senators, debating the Road Traffic Regulations Notice, 2017 said the country had an obligation to harmonise its licences with that of the region, especially now that His Majesty King Mswati III was SADC Chairperson.

Leading the debate, mover of the motion Senator Ndumiso Mdluli said it was always an embarrassment when one drove outside the country and had to explain what their driver's licence was because traffic police in other countries didn't recognise the local licences.

"We are always explaining what we are carrying and why are the licences not at par with those of the region. It is an embarrassment that needs to be rectified as soon as possible," he said.

He then asked when the ministry

was planning on implementing this, especially because the country was moving towards achieving first world status. He also wanted to know what would happen to driving schools when the SADC licences came to force.

Retested

"What will they have to do to be compatible with SADC standards? Will inspectors be retested and reeducated, so that they are of that standard? We need clarity on these things," he said.

Senator Chief Ngome Ndlangamandla said it was a disgrace that the world had respected and honoured the country by giving it the SADC chairpersonship but Swaziland was failing to comply with set rules of the region like that of regional driver's licences.

He said the ministry of works and transport needed to make sure that Swaziland was complaint as soon as possible. "We are the laughing stock of the region," he said.

20-YEAR TAX HOLIDAY TOO MUCH - SENATORS

MINISTER of Commerce, Industry and Trade Jabulani Mabuza has explained that government was giving investors coming into the country to operate in the Special Economic Zones a 20-year tax holiday so as to create jobs and attract more foreign investors.

Mabuza revealed this when moving for the adoption of the Special Economic Zones Bill last Thursday.

He stated that Swaziland was competing with other countries to attract the investors, hence they had to put up incentives that would make the investors opt for the country.

He said it was important that senators and the society understood that the country was disadvantaged in that it was landlocked, hence it had to step up and provide other incentives like tax holidays in order to be an ideal destination for investors.

Mabuza further pleaded with the senators to look beyond the fact that the country would not be getting tax but that people would be employed.

"This is more about job creation than it is about bringing in revenue into the country. We will also make sure that people employed in these businesses fall within the taxable bracket, which is how the country will make revenue," he said.

He said government was well aware that not much revenue would be made from the people's tax but the objective was to get more Swazis employed.

He said since the objective was to get more Swazis employed, part of the agreements they would get into with the investors would be that 90% of their employers would be Swazis while the 10% would be left to them.

He further said companies that would be allowed to ply their trade in these zones would be business that had a cash injection amounting to E70 million while Swazi investors wanting to open shop in the zones needed at E30 million in their accounts to be allowed space.

Even with all his explanations, the senators said the 20 years was too much. Each senator that made submissions on the day said the initiative was okay just that the 20 years was a bit too much.

Senator Mike Temple said government had chosen that as an incentive because it was the quickest and easiest option.

"There are many incentive options that can be considered, you just chose this one because it is the easiest," he said.

Senator Meninjeni Mahlalela said much as they wanted job opportunities for the people, 20 years was too much "We want jobs but we can't sell our land in the process," he said.

Senator Themba Ginindza concurred with Mahlalela.

SPECIAL ECONOMIC ZONE BILL PASSED INTO ACT

SENATORS passed the Special Economic Zone Bill 2017 into an Act, with reservations.

The Bill, which was brought to Senate by Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Jabulani Mabuza, was passed by senators after a lengthy debate.

The senators, during the debate, each said much as the country needed foreign investors, the 20-year-tax holiday was still too much and some even said they were scared the country was going back to the times when foreign investors were given a five-year tax holiday as they could leave on the fourth year.

The senators wanted to know how government would make sure that the investors would not leave just before the 20 years elapsed. Senator Themba Ginindza, who appeared very worried when making his submissions, wanted to know if there would be a commitment fee or a penalty in place for investors who would leave just before the 20-year tax free period elapsed.

Investor

Ginindza said government had to put an instrument in place to protect herself in the event an investor left. "What happens when an investor decides on the year just before the 20 years elapses that he is no longer interested in investing the country? Is there a commitment fee that they will pay then forfeit if they decide to just leave or a penalty fee?" he asked the minister.

Senator Moi Moi Masilela wondered why the ministers who had been in politics for a longtime had not properly advised Minister Mabuza.

Masilela said the country had gone through something similar before and now it was left with white elephants all over with huge factory shells for sup-

posed foreign investors who would leave on the year their tax free period elapsed. "Why didn't the seasoned ministers correctly advise you?" he wondered. "Your very ministry built factory shells that are now empty. I have heard everything you are saying now and it was said by the minister who built factory shells, which are now unoccupied," he said.

Prince Kusa, making his submission. said government had a responsibility to create jobs for people but he was not convinced that this was the rightful way to go about it.

"Government must create jobs for people but I am not convinced that the Special Economic Zones are an answer to that," he said. He said there was still need for the ministry to fine tune the Bill before it could be passed by Senate.

SD, ZAMBIA DISCUSS BIO-FUEL, SOLAR ENERGY

HIS Majesty King Mswati III has observed that energy is key to the industrialisation agenda and has expressed the country's desire to learn from Zambia's experience in developing other sources of energy such as coal, bio-fuel and solar.

This is contained in the communiqué that was published after Zambia President Edgar Lungu's two-day visit to the kingdom last week.

The communiqué states that the king has observed that the is need for Swaziland to learn from Zambia's experience in developing other sources of energy such as coal, bio-fuel and solar, as energy is the key to the industrialisation agenda.

The communiqué also states that there is need for the Swaziland and Zambia to explore areas of cooperation and the potential for trade as well as share information, exchange experiences, best practices and visits, and acknowledged that there are many Zambians in the country contributing to the development of the kingdom. It further states that His Majesty the king stated that the Kingdom of Swaziland is making progress following on the AU Agenda 2063 and SADC programme under its vision 2022 to become a First World Nation by 2022.

"His Majesty the king has also called for African countries to stand together and manage their resources emphasising the need to find African solutions to African challenges.

The king stated that climate change and fall army worms had affected the SADC region in particular, the kingdom of Swaziland and expressed the Kingdom's desire to learn how Zambia manages to successfully fight the fall army worms. He identified trade opportunities for the Kingdom to import maize grain from Zambia given that Zambia has a surplus and the Kingdom

of Swaziland having a deficit," reads the communiqué.

The communiqué also states that during his visit President Lungu recalled the Swaziland's steadfast support to the Frontline States efforts during the liberation struggle in Southern Africa by allowing freedom fighters passage through its territory.

"The president noted that Zambia and Swaziland signed cooperation Agreements in the past that need to be reviewed.

In this regard, the president called for the revival of the Joint Permanent Commission of Cooperation and to strengthen bilateral ties between the two countries, which would also serve as a vehicle to accelerate regional integration.


The President expressed Zambia's desire to emulate Swaziland's emphasis on culture as a way of life noting that the two nations have shared deeprooted traditional similarities in particular those from the Eastern and

Western parts of Zambia, therefore he expressed a desire for the two countries to cooperate in that area including the management of traditional structures," states the communiqué.

It further states that both leaders emphasised the need for African countries to speak in one voice on the reform of the United Nations Security Council during the forthcoming UN General Assembly in September, 2017, in New York.

In conclusion, the two leaders reaffirmed the need to enhance bilateral cooperation for the mutual benefit of the two countries and the region as a whole.

"During the official talks, held at the Lozitha Palace, both heads of state, accompanied by their respective delegations reviewed a wide range of bilateral, regional and international issues wherein they expressed satisfaction at the excellent bilateral relations existing between the two countries, founded on long standing his-

torical, political, economic and cultural ties," states the communiqué.

The communiqué further states that King Mswati III commended Zambia's development efforts based on a people centred approach and the commitment by His Excellency Edgar Chagwa Lungu to lead the people of Zambia to prosperity.

His Majesty King Mswati III particularly noted the impressive infrastructure development programmes taking place in Zambia.

E5m set aside for security forces fund

GOVERNMENT has set aside E5 million for a fund to compensate members of security forces if they die or get injured in line of duty.

This is contained in a report of the ministry of finance portfolio committee on the legal notice for the Security Forces and Services Compensation Special Fund Regulations, 2017.

Government, according to the report, has already set aside E5 million in the current financial year, to be deposited to the security services special fund. The report was tabled by Lobamba Lomdzala MP Marwick Khumalo, in his capacity as chairperson of

the portfolio committee.

The regulations include Umbutfo Swaziland Defence Force (USDF), Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSPS), His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) and Swaziland National Fire and Emergency Services (SNFES).

Budget

Government has set aside this amount based on claims submitted by members of the security forces, which date back to 1975 and have been used by government to budget for the fund. The money will be paid by government annually, as appropriated by Parliament. There is also a provision for other organisations to donate to the fund from time to time.

The fund is expected to be administered by a committee

appointed by the minister of finance. The committee will have the responsibility of considering claims submitted, approving or disapproving claims, and advising the minister on any aspect related to the fund.

The committee will be composed of representatives from each of the security forces, ministry of labour and social security, ministry of health and ministry of finance. The representative form the ministry of finance shall be the chairperson of the fund.

Compensation

A claim under the fund shall be 50 per cent of the total amount of compensation paid in respect of the same claim under the Workmen's Compensation Act of 1983 or its successor. Any claim for compensation under the fund will be based on the assessment made under the workmen's compensation Act of 1983 or its successor. This shall be a once-off payment.

The fund, according to the report, should be in existence because government has seen the need to compensate members of securi-

ty services and forces for casualties on duty.

Risk

Security forces and services, because of the nature of their work, are more exposed to risk of death or injury on duty. The deaths and injuries have become more frequent, hence the need for such a fund.

Dependents of members of these organisations who have died on duty are also expected to be covered by the fund.

The report is yet to be adopted by the House of Assembly, before the regulations can be passed.

SRIC sidelined from the fund

THE administration of the fund should have been outsourced to SRIC, but such could not happen because of high premiums.

This is contained in the report of the ministry of finance portfolio committee on the legal notice for The Security Forces and Services Compensation Special Fund Regulations, 2017. The Swaziland Royal Insurance Corporation (SRIC) was sidelined because it has high premiums of E8 million per annum.

If the fund was outsourced to the SRIC, officers of the security forces and services would be covered for 24 hours. Officers who would have suffered injury or death in the line of duty would be paid a maximum compensation of E300 000.

It should be noted that the same claim will depend on the gravity of the injury.

Annual premiums to cover all officers will be E8 million

and claims would be processed within 24 hours. The policy will only cover injury and death in line of duty, not sickness.

The insurance company claimed to have an infrastructure already in place and security officers who had a policy with the organisation wherein the confidentiality component would be highly prioritised.

The MPs, who are members of the portfolio committee, recommended that the ministry of finance should seriously consider engaging SRIC. This, according to the MPs, would be a good decision because the company has an IT system already in place to easily capture and store the data of each members of the security forces and services.

Government, according to the legislators, failed to demonstrate that it would be able to come up with a system or software that will match what SRIC

already has.

The fund is supposed to be funded from the consolidated fund, which experiences financial bottlenecks from time to time. The MPs were of the view that such would not be good for the fund because it could experience financial difficulties.

In short, the MPs recommended to the House that the fund, in its current form, be halted. It should be temporarily handed over to the SRIC.

In the meantime, the fund should consider creating a fund similar to that of Sincephetelo Motor Vehicle Accident Fund (SMVAF). The SMVAF is funded by vehicles in the country.

Owners of vehicles pay a certain percentage of the money they spend every time they fill up their vehicles with fuel.



"WE all have a responsibility in protecting forests against any danger as by so doing we also help in protecting jobs for those employed in the plantations as well as ensuring the growth of the country's economy."

Shiselweni Forestry Company (SFC) Silviculture Manager Sabelo Khoza said it was not just the duty of forest plantations to protect their farms but every community too.

"It's not just for the benefit of SFC as the forest fires are also a threat to human lives. As a company, we have decided to take it upon ourselves to go around educating the communities on the need to partner with us and this should not be taken lightly," said

Khoza said 'honey hunters' were also supposed to consider not invading forest plantations as this has also proved to be the cause of disasters experienced in other areas.

"It's something we frown upon and we advise all those doing this to stop. As a company, we encourage honey hunters to approach the company using the right procedures. The company has its public relations manager and should there be someone interested in something, be it honey or firewood, there are channels to be followed,' said Khoza.

Khoza said it was important that even schools were educated about the importance of protecting forests.

Umphakatsi feels anyone causing damage to forest is an enemy

THOSE that destroy forests in any form deserve a harsh punishment.

Mbangweni Umphakatsi Headman Peter Mamba stressed the importance of supporting companies who are in the forest plantation industry such as Shiselweni Forestry Company

He said such companies were also the backbone of the country's economy.

"Let it be known that those who are destroying forests through fire, are the country's enemies. We know how important such a company is to the country's economy.

It is everyone's duty to see all forests protected and should there be anyone crossing the line regarding this, there should be a heavy penalty.

Culprits should be harshly dealt with as we know this company has created jobs for our brothers and sisters," said Mamba. **Species**

Mamba said it should also be taken into consideration that even human beings or any species rely on vegetation when it comes to breathing.

Back at school, we were told that we inhale oxygen and exhale carbon dioxide.

It should be known that human beings cannot survive without oxygen. It is important to have some of these vegetations as they help us even when we inhale and exhale," said Mamba.

Mamba said fire was useful but there should be precautions when used.

He said using fire anyhow should be discouraged.

'Programme meant to create bond between company, communities'

SFC Public Relations Manager Sibongile Sylvia Kunene says visiting communities to educate them about the dangers of forest fires and timber theft is meant to strengthen their relationship with them.

She said visiting the communities was an idea meant to improve the partnership. "It's not a talk show but an important exercise meant to strengthen the partnership. We are trying to come closer to the people who we consider as important stakeholders. These communities need us and vice-versa. It is therefore a good thing to be there for each other.

Through the support we get from the communities, we are also able to assist in projects that are of benefit to them. It cannot be possible to see the company pumping money in projects when on the other hand, it does not enjoy any support of the communities," said

Kunene said the company would be going around conducting the exercise with the purpose of making the communities feel that they are part of the company. Man fined E2 500 for defying RA

A man has been sentenced to two years for failure to appear before Shiselweni Regional Administrator Themba Masuku.

Sibusiso Baraba Simelane of Engwanyameni area appeared before the Nhlangano Swazi National Court for defying a court order to see the RA where he would be advised on consequences of tempering with farm property whose owner had lodged a complaint with the RA office.

He was supposed to see the RA last Monday.

There is reportedly bad blood between farm owners with community members in areas around Engwanyameni near Zombodze Emuva and such an issue has been referred to the RA's office with the purpose of creating harmony between the two parties.

Simelane happened to be among the other community members whose

homesteads are close to the farms.

For defying the RA, he appeared before Court President Chief Makhosikhosi.

Disrespect

It is said police arrived at Simelane's home where they served him with the document which was advising him to report at the RA's offices.

He is said to have refused to listen anything he was told to do, including signing the document which was advising him to appear before the RA. "On July 17, 2017 accused failed to appear before the Shiselweni Regional Administrator while duly warned by members of the Royal Swaziland Police," the charge sheet partly reads. When the court wanted to know as to why Simelane had decided to disrespect the overseer of the region, he said he was acting on instruction of the legal team representing them as residents on the matter.

Consent

"I did not intend defying the RA, but when the police arrived with the document which they asked me to sign, I recalled what our lawyer said as he instructed us that we should not sign anything without his consent said Simelane, who looked for remorseful. Court President Chief Makhosikhosi said Simelane should know the consequences of failing to heed orders issued by courts.

"It is also important to respect the rule of law and the police who were doing their duty and look now where this has landed you," said Chief Makhosikhosi. In mitigation, Simelane appealed for leniency, saying he was sorry for acting the way he did.

He was then sentenced to two years in jail or an option of E2 500 fine. Simelane paid the fine and gained his freedom.

'Selling shisanyama in PPK remains illegal'

PIGG'S Peak Town Council Chief Executive Officer Mzwandile Ndzinisa has said selling of shisanyama using braai stands remains illegal in the town.

He said such dated back to 1969. Ndzinisa was speaking to this newspaper last Wednesday after five shisanyama braai stands were confiscated by the town Council last week.

In his official response, Ndzinisa confirmed that the Pigg's Peak Town Council apprehended and confiscated the braai stands after a meeting was conducted with the braai operators.

"The Pigg's Peak Town Council confisticated the braai stands, but this was done following a meeting that was convened with the affected operators late last year. During this meeting, the operators were advised on proper ways of conducting business within the small town of Pigg's Peak," he said

The sale of shisanyama using braai stands remains illegal in Pigg's Peak, as it is a contravention of the following legislation; Public Health (food hygiene) regulations of 1970 that prohibits the sale of unhealthy or unwholesome food to the public the Urban Government Act of 1969 Section 49 that states that no person shall make or cause a fire that has the potential of endangering the safety of the public or building. The Urban Government Act of 1969

Section 28 prohibits the sale of any goods in a public place or street without a permit from Council but as the Pigg's Peak Town Council, we support small and medium enterprises to operate in town, but we do not encourage them to contravene the law," he

Meanwhile, one of the shisanyama operators Nkosinathi Dlamini said it was not fair to be enslaved by a 48-year-old law.

"We are not stealing anything, but just trying to earn a living with this business.

It is not fair that the law has not been changed in over 48 years so we will now leave our braai stands at home and continue selling our product to the public in takeaway packs," he said.





HOW TO DEAL WITH SUICIDAL THOUGHTS OR INTENTIONS

PEOPLE around the world have reeled at the news of Linkin Park frontman Chester Bennington's death by suicide. For many, his music was the soundtrack to their generation, and his loss is devastating.

But this is not an obituary for Chester - I was not much of a fan and I don't know too much about him. What I do know is that whenever a high-profile person commits suicide, there is a great deal of commentary on social media about society's response to this ultimate expression of mental illness.

My friends who suffer from mental illness talk about the importance of ending the stigma, and making it easier for people who live with this debilitating condition (or collection of conditions) to come forward and ask for the help they need.


And then there are the people who say that some organisations suggest that protocol should be to never mention the method of death when someone commits suicide, so as not to give anyone any ideas.

Right, so we're supposed to end the stigma and talk about it while at the same time not mentioning it.

There are also those who implore their mentally ill friends to come forward. They share Facebook statuses encouraging others to share to show that at any time, someone is listen-

And then there are those who say that really, when a person is at the point of considering suicide, they can't ask for help. The very thing that's driving them to suicide is the thing that prevents them from reaching out to those who love them.

So, honestly, with so many people who are experts by dint of actually

having a form of mental illness, and so many who work in the health or youth media or mental health care giving contradictory messages, there's little wonder that no one really knows what to do.

This being the case, what do we do or say when we suspect someone might be suicidal or are confronted with a person who is. First, it's a good idea to know the risk factors (all the following points are taken from the National Institute of Mental Health in the US):

- Depression, other mental disor ders, or substance abuse disorder.
- Certain medical conditions. Chronic pain.
- A prior suicide attempt.
- Family history of a mental dis
- order or substance abuse. Family history of suicide.
- Family violence, including phys ical or sexual abuse.
- Having guns or other firearms in the home. Having recently been released
- from prison or jail.
- Being exposed to others' suici dal behaviour, such as that of family members, peers, or celebrities.

Then it's a good idea to know the

- signs of suicidal tendencies:
- Talking about wanting to die or wanting to kill themselves.
- Talking about feeling empty, hope less, or having no reason to live.
- Making a plan or looking for a way to kill themselves, such as searching online, stockpiling pills, or buying a gun.
- Talking about great guilt or shame. Talking about feeling trapped or
- feeling that there are no solutions. Feeling unbearable pain (emo-
- tional pain or physical pain) Talking about being a burden to
- others. Using alcohol or drugs more often
- Acting anxious or agitated.
- Withdrawing from family and friends.
- Changing eating and/or sleeping
- habits. Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge.
- Taking great risks that could lead to death, such as driving extremely fast.
- Talking or thinking about death often.
- Displaying extreme mood swings, suddenly changing from very sad to very calm or happy.
- Giving away important posses-

- Saying goodbye to friends and family.
- Putting affairs in order, making

And finally, if you think someone is in fact suicidal, these are the steps to helping:

1. Ask: "Are you thinking about killing yourself?" It's not an easy question but studies show that asking at-risk individuals if they are suicidal does not increase suicides or suicidal thoughts.

2. Keep them safe: Reducing a suicidal person's access to highly lethal items or places is an important part of suicide prevention. While this is not always easy, asking if the at-risk person has a plan and removing or disabling the fethal means can make a difference.

3. Be there: Listen carefully and learn what the individual is thinking and feeling. Findings suggest acknowledging and talking about suicide may in fact reduce rather than increase suicidal thoughts.

4. Help them connect: In South Africa, the best organisations to contact for help are either the South African Depression and Anxiety Group (SADAG) at www.sadag.org or 080 021 2223 or Lifeline at lifelinesa.co.za or 011 715 2000.

5. You can also help make a connection with a trusted individual like a family member, friend, spiritual advisor, or mental health professional.

6. Stay Connected: Staying in touch after a crisis or after being discharged from care can make a difference. Studies have shown the number of suicide deaths goes down when someone follows up with the at-risk

Speaking as someone who has lost two loved ones to suicide, I can understand the desperate need that we all feel to prevent something like this from happening to the suicide victim themselves, but also to their friends and families. I speak with absolute authority when I say that no matter what a suicidal person might think, their families are not better off without them. Please don't think twice about getting help. eNCA

to trust a new idea, we are paying for the sins of the UDM [United Democratic Movement] and COPE and other parties that came before us. These people want to see if we will do things differently."

Malema said that his brother now called him with updates on the very same people who were sceptical of the EFF and were now living in party regalia, "refus-

SWAZI RALLY TO CONTRIBUTE E15 MILLION TO THE ECONOMY

THE annual bikers event, Swazi Rally, is expected to help different industries cash in at least E15 million.

This was disclosed by Swazi Rally founder Carlos Paiva during the launch of the event where they have partnered with Wesbank.

particular year.

"The bikers further contribute to road tax; they buy fuel as they move around the country.

Apart from that the bikers fill up accommodation establishments as over the years accommodation is scarce during the Swazi Rally," she said.

Swaziland Tourism Authority

CBS LEAVES BANK RATE UNCHANGED FOR 3RD TIME

FOR the third time in a row this year, the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS), together with the Monetary Policy Consultative Committee (MPCC), has decided to leave the bank rate unchanged at 7.25 per cent.

The South African Reserve Bank (SARB) lowered its benchmark repo rate by 25 basis points to 6.75 per cent, its first cut since 2012 last Thursday.

The CBS and the MPCC held their meeting last Friday to consider the appropriate monetary policy path for the bank for the upcoming two months.

To arrive at the appropriate path of monetary policy, the bank has to consider recent international, regional and domestic economic conditions, and especially how such affects the achievement of the bank's mandate of ensuring both price and financial stability.

In his statement, CBS Governor Majozi Sithole noted that inflation eased slightly to 6.9 per cent in June, down from 7.1 per cent in May.

This slowdown was a result of the continuous moderation in food inflation which remained in single digits for the third consecutive month.

The governor said in June, food inflation came in at 8.5 per cent against a higher level of 9.4 per cent in May.

"The bank expects inflation to average above seven per cent for 2017. This is mainly on account of upward revisions in prices of electricity, water and other administered items. Inflation expectations are softened by better harvest which will help further reduce food inflation over the remainder of the year. The general expectation that inflation will remain high for 2017 swayed the bank to leave interest rates unchanged," he said.

Over the period March to May 2017, the bank also observed that credit extended to the private sector had been growing at a steady

Extension

Compared to May 2016, Sithole said private sector credit extension grew by 6.5 per cent at the end of May, slightly lower than the 7.0 per cent growth recorded in March, when compared to March 2016.

He said growth in credit to the business and household sectors slowed whilst credit to 'other sectors' (mainly other financial corporations and local government) improved marginally. "Compared to March and May 2016, credit extended to the business sector maintained double-digit growth, but declined from 14.2 per cent in March, to reach 13.4 per cent at the end of May. Growth in credit extended to the household sector also came down from 4.7 per cent in March 2017 to 3.8 per cent at the end of May," he said.

The governor said the bank would continue to monitor developments that will influence the movements of inflation and reassured members of the public that it would act appropriately if there were significant changes to the inflation outlook.

"Further, the bank reassures the public that the bank's monetary policy stance shall remain supportive to economic growth and employment," he said.

The CBS monetary policy stance comes at a time when some analysts believe that monetary policy easing can be justified.

During a presentation early this month, Standard Bank Head- African Research Phumelele Mbiyo said monetary policy easing can be justified, especially because the country's economic growth had been pretty much depressed.

Answering why it would be consistent for monetary policy to be eased, Mbiyo said part of the pressure that had led to inflation being exceptionally high, was because of food inflation pressure.

"In fact in Southern Africa, what we saw during the course of 2016 was that headline inflation was elevated, but it was mostly because of food inflation pressure and not so much from any underlining inflationary pressures that were evident in these economies," he said.

Mbiyo said the same dynamics were observed in the country.

However, he said in their view, food inflation would come off and therefore headline inflation would also come off.

"Given the view that inflation is coming down and the fact that economic growth has been depressed for quite a while, if monetary policy can be eased, it would not be inconsistent with maintaining overall macroeconomic stability," he said

SACU QUARTERLY INFLOW **BOOSTS RESERVES BY E1.5BN**

THE Southern African Customs Union (SACU) quarterly inflow has increased the country gross official reserves by E1.5 billion, from E6.9 billion to settle at E8.4 billion as at July 14.

The country's reserves opened at E8.2 billion in January backed by the SACU quarterly inflow. They decreased to E7.6 billion in February, further decreased to E7.3 billion in March, increased again to E8.2 billion in April backed by the SACU quarterly inflow again, then decreased to E7.4 billion in

May and finally slid to E6.9 billion by end of June.

According to the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) Governor's recent Monetary Policy statement, following the CBS and the Monetary Policy Consultative Committee (MPCC) meeting last Friday, the country's reserves posi-

tion was improving, but remained under pressure because of the challenging financial situation faced by the

"As at July 14, gross official reserves increased by 21.3 per cent to settle at E8.4 billion, up from the E6.9 billion observed at the end of June. The increase in the level of reserves was mainly due to the quarterly Southern African Customs Union (SACU) revenue inflows," he

At this value the reserves could cover an estimated 3.9 months of imports of goods and services.

Speaking to this publication prior to the MPCC meeting, the governor said the reserves were mainly depleted by government's obligations.

> country had so far managed to sit at least above the three months threshold.

He said though the volatility trend was common, they would have wanted to have reserves that could at least cover six months of imports.

What is important though is to ensure that the country has enough funds available to pay for its external obligations. For us, what is most critical is that we are within the Common Monetary Area (CMA) as most of the things that we purchase are priced in rands," he said.

The governor said they were currently looking at measures to increase the country's reserves.

"We are not comfortable being just around three months of import cover. We need to increase our reserves. But, we also understand there will be challenges with the existing economic hurdles. Existing reserves cannot be only that of government, hence we are exploring other ways to increases our reserves," he said.

'COUNTRY STILL HAS HEALTHY RELATIONS WITH UK'

MINISTER of Commerce Industry and Trade Jabulani Mabuza has assured businesses that the country still has a healthy trading relationship with the United Kingdom (UK).

This comes after the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) welcomed the UK's intention of preventing disruption of trade relations with other countries as it leaves the European Union (EU)

This was affirmed in a joint statement issued by the SACU and the UK following discussions between trade ministers from the two parties in Johannesburg last week Wednesday.

"As a country we had to act swift in ensuring that our healthy relationship with the United Kingdom is sustained. We are happy that everything is in order and as a country we will continue to trade with the United Kingdom," Mabuza said.

"The meeting was to further strengthen trading relations with UK as they are planning to exit the European Union (EU). We intend to maintain our duty free and quota free agreement," he added.

Mabuza said the two sides agreed to continue discussions to explore ways to ensure that the existing trade arrangement between the UK and SACU currently governed by the EU-SADC EPA will not be disrupted by the UK's departure from the EU, and

to ensure continuity of the effects of the EU-SADC EPA.

According to South African publication Business Report, UK Minister Lord Price confirmed that the trade relationship between the UK and the Southern African Custo countries (SACU) would not be disrupted due to the Brexit process. Last year SADC countries - Botswana, Lesotho, Namibia, Mozambique, South Africa, and Swaziland - signed an Economic Partnership Agreement (EPA) with the EU. The UK reaffirmed its commitment to the trade agreement under the current deal and said it would maintain duty-free quotafree market access. "It is important that we ensure that there are no disruptions with the trading relationship with South Africa as well as with other SADC countries. We have to

make sure that nobody suffers because of a gap between us leaving the EU and striving for new deals," said Price.

The discussions between UK and SADC (SACU) countries are focused on steps to agree on a deal that replithe effects of the EPA once the UK has left the EU. "We have come to a very practical solution that we will maintain what we have today and make sure that it is enforced in April 2018," he said. The UK is scheduled to leave on EU next March - but it can be extended if all 28 EU members agree. South African Minister of Trade and Industry Rob Davies stated that they all agreed that it would be essential to roll-over the EPA when the UK leaves the EU. "We are essentially looking out for some elements of continuity from the first instance," said Davies.

"We felt that meeting in restaurants around Johannesburg wasn't private enough hence coming up with this platform," she said.

"We also offer virtual office space, hot desking (shared space), casual pass. Boardroom space, all of these services are available at different prices and can accommodate up to 30 people depending on the space that is needed," she

Motsa said more services included facilitation of company and trading licence registration as well as application for work permits for expatriates in the country.

The company believes that vision 2022 is therefore fulfilled through such concepts."It helps to minimise the startup capital challenges and also assist businesses to test their ideas in the market. It also allows most businesses to benefit from the open-plan set up for networking and exchange of ideas," she said.

FNB economists welcome interest rates cut

JOHANNESBURG - Economists cast Friday welcomed the decreased interest rates, saying that it would have a positive impact on many sectors of the economy, including agriculture, investment and franchising.

This comes after the South African Reserve Bank (SARB) announced on cast Thursday, that the Monetary Policy Committee had decided to reduce the repurchase rate by 25 basis points, to 6.75 per cent, due to the improved inflation outlook and the deteriorated growth outlook.

Pressure

The prime lending rate, the figure charged by banks to customers, will now decline to 10.25 per cent.

Paul Makube, Senior Agricultural Economist at FNB, said the decreased interest rate was a welcome breather as it would help ease pressure on farmers and agribusinesses, further improving profitability.

"The reduced costs of doing business will eventually benefit the consumer in terms of lower food prices," Makube said. 'It will further improve the feasibility of delayed or stalled investment projects which have a potential to unlock employment opportunities in the sector."

Chantal Marx, Head of Research at FNB Securities, said the cut and persistence of the governor's dovish

tone highlighted that now may be a good time to consider increasing exposure to interest rate sensitive stocks locally.

"Usually when the reserve bank cuts rates, consumers receive some relief in terms of debt repayments and may have a little more to spend on discretionary goods, this will be boosted by lower inflation as well. Interest rate sensitive stock include clothing, furniture, and car retail and travel and leisure stocks," Marx said.

Assist

Riaan Fouché, Head of FNB Franchising International Development, said the decreased interest rate would assist with lower debt service costs for franchisees and more cash flow.

"This enables expansion strategies of Franchisors which will have a positive impact in creating employment within the country. It will also allow franchisees the opportunity to settle existing debt a little quicker than before," Fouché said.

Reserve Bank Governor Lesetja Kganyago warned though that a number of risks to the inflation outlook persisted and that the rand remained vulnerable to heightened political uncertainty, global monetary policy developments and possible further credit ratings downgrades. Afican News Agency

Zim economy to grow 3.7% in 2017: finance minister

HARARE - Zimbabwe's economy will grow by 3.7 per cent in 2017, according to Finance Minister Patrick Chinamasa, despite a public sector wage bill devouring much of the government's expenditure.

Chinamasa said that growth would be boosted by the farming sector, which is forecast to grow by 21.3 per cent this year, along with mining, which will grow by 5.1 per

He said tax revenues were expected to total \$3.7-billion (R47.8-billion) for the year, but warned that the soaring public sector jobs bill left little for capital expenditure. "The overall employment costs for 2016 remained unsustainably high at \$3.21-billion, accounting for 91.7 percent of total revenue," he said . "The level of the wage bill continues to present challenges related to Bridge cash flows."

Under long-time President Robert Mugabe, Zimbabwe has suffered mass unemployment, a collapse of many public services and banknote shortages as foreign investors have

Zimbabwe's economic output has halved since 2000 and unemployment stands at over 90 per cent with the government the country's only reliable employer.

Chinamasa also revealed that Zimbabwe's debt pile currently stands at \$11.3 billion - \$4 billion of which is held by domestic creditors with the rest in foreign hands. To contend with crippling cash shortages, Zimbabwe last year introduced a new local currency called "bond notes" which were initially pegged to the US dollar but have lost value against the greenback on the black market .iNet

How to make SA an Innovation & Startup nation

the Global Innovation Index on Innovation, South Africa is ranked No 97 in innovation.

The index measures the innovation performance of 127 economies.

There are couple of contributing factors to the state of innovation in South Africa and one of them is related to the nature of education and the lack of innovation culture across the board.

Although South Africa spends the largest percentage of its budget on education the return on investment is not the same. To improve innovation, there's a need to pay over zealous attention to the nature of education and support for innovation culture. The view that South Africa is the toughest place to be an innovator has led some to wonder, what can be done to make it an innovation nation.

Innovation

There are numerous interventions required to make South Africa a tech innovation and start-up nation. Education is one such intervention and another is the creation of a tech-innovation special economic zone.

A matriculant in South Africa spends 12 years or more at school, but walks out of school with no form of skills or ability to earn a living. The same is true for university graduates, who in some instances spend five years in an academic institution and walk out with no form of practical experience to be useful in the economy. Academics would argue that academic institutions are not designed to enable people to be economically active. This is the reason why South Africa is not yet an innovation nation. Education institutions are not designed

JOHANNESBURG - According to to develop innovative and economically active citizens. There's a need to create a training institution for start-ups where candidates walk in with a business idea and walk out with an operational business. Such a school can develop entrepreneurs at a young age (school going age). Instead of granting bursaries, such an institution would have to fund its graduates to start businesses. Educators in such an institution would have to be drawn from entrepreneurs and experienced business people. With valuable insights they can be more useful in preparing young entrepreneurs to run their own

Mentorship

Entrepreneurs and venture capitalists can be the first group of investors into graduate businesses instead of traditional financial institutions. Each year the startup school can develop 100 or more entrepreneurs with new businesses that can also form part of mentorship programme to future students.

Once graduated these start-ups need to be located in what I would call innovation-free economic zones. In the startup world it's a known fact that in the first three years a start-up is likely to die due to challenges associated with starting a business in South Africa.

To protect great innovations from disappearing due to government red tape and start-up challenges a dedicated safe environment is required. Technologyfree economic zones can become such environments where innovators' products and services can be allowed to flourish, where regulation such as licences and taxes can be relaxed until the startup is ready to enter the real economy.



These zones would be like special economic zones, geographically designated areas of a country set aside for specifically targeted economic activities, supported through special arrangements and systems that are often different from those that apply in the rest of the coun-

Economic zone

This approach could be applied to a company like Uber by locating it initially in a free economic zone and allowing it to operate, without requiring it to follow similar processes for taxi operators. Once its economical impact had been demonstrated and the concept proved it would then enter the broader economy and be subject to taxation and leg-

Many innovations have died due to to overcome in order to be acceptable. One comes to mind by the founder of Iyeza Express, a medicine delivery (by bicycle in townships) concept by Sizwe Nzima. He was prevented from running the business because he was not licensed to deliver medicine. Where is Iveza Express today? The Infonomist will work towards documenting these innovators to ensure that they do not die because they are too advanced for current rules.

In South Africa we face abnormally high unemployment rates. Such a challenge calls for a different approach. Current methods are not working. IOL



'I'll jump for joy (if my legs hold out)': Ageing Mugabe acknowledges frailty

LUPANE - In a rare acknowledgement of his frailty, President Robert Mugabe has said he will jump for joy at the loyalty and love shown by his party's youth wing, but if he can't jump physically, he'll use his

"I am happy, I jump about. If I can't do it with my legs I'll do it with my heart," the 93year-old president told a youth rally in western Zimbabwe on Friday.

He commended the youths for showing "no desire at the moment to be successors when the president is still there".

As he grows ever more frail, so the jockeying for positions by senior officials within the ruling ZANU-PF party becomes more

But Mugabe said that wasn't the case with the youths. "My heart is overwhelmed by your love and confidence in me... I am happy, he said in comments broadcast on state ZBC TV. Since June, Mugabe has held four youth "interface rallies". The one in Lupane on Friday had to be postponed by a week after the president made an unexpected visit to Singapore for a medical check-up. Officials insist he only goes there for specialised eye treatment. Mugabe is counting on youths to shore up support for his re-election bid next year. Support from his former die-hard loyalists, the war veterans, appears to be on the wane. The president said senior party officials needed to emulate the unity shown by the youths. New224

Nigeria's ex-oil minister battles slew of graft cases

LAGOS - Nigeria's former oil minister faces charges only at home but her name crops up in a growing number of international cases that lift the lid on the scale of alleged corruption in the country's oil sec-

Since leaving office in 2015, Diezani Alison-Madueke has been implicated in bribery, fraud, misuse of public funds, and money laundering cases in Nigeria, Britain, Italy and the United States. The first female president of the global oil cartel OPEC - who was one of Africa's most prominent politicians - has always denied the allegations, which involve billions of dollars syphoned from oil deals and state coffers.

But former US State Department Nigeria specialist Matthew Page suggested that a US civil forfeiture case to seize \$144 million of assets from allegedly ill-gotten crude contracts may just be the start of Alison-Madueke's legal troubles. "Although this is the first attempt by US law enforcement to go after assets allegedly stolen by Diezani and her henchmen, it almost certainly will not be the last," he told AFP. Nigeria's President Muhammadu Buhari, elected in 2015 on a promise to elim-

inate graft, has said that "mind-boggling" sums of public money were stolen by previous administrations.

DRC opposition unveil plans to force Kabila out

KINSHASA - The Congolese opposition on Saturday unveiled a rolling programme of strikes and civil disobedience aimed at forcing President Joseph Kabila from power.

The announcement was made after two days of opposition talks in Kinshasa, amid concerns that Kabila, in power since 2001, is seeking to remain in place in defiance of constitutional limits.

Elections in the Democratic Republic of Congo are due this year under a transitional deal aimed at avoiding fresh political violence in the sprawling country of 71 million people after Kabila failed to step down when his second mandate ended in December 2016.

Under the deal, Kabila is allowed to remain in office pending the elections, in late 2017, ruling in tandem with a

transitional watchdog and a new premier, chosen from within opposition ranks. Under its newly unveiled plan of action, a two-day general strike will be held throughout the country from August 8 "as a warning," said Francois Muamba,

rapporteur of the opposition conclave. Then on August 20, the opposition plans simultaneous rallies in the capital Kinshasa and 25 provinces.

If Kabila does not by the end of September set an election date he will "no longer be recognised as president of the republic on October 1," said Muamba, speaking at the headquarters of the main opposition Union for Democracy and Social Progress (UDPS) in Kinshasa.

From that date, the opposition will invite the people to stop paying taxes to the state or paying their bills to the water and electricity monopolies.

On New Year's Eve, progovernment and opposition groups agreed to a deal brokered by the influential Roman Catholic Church that sought to avert a full-fledged crisis in the country. News24

Zambia's opposition leader marks 100 days in jail

LUSAKA - Zambian opposition leader Hakainde Hichilema has expressed concern over what he described as "inhuman prison conditions," as he marked 100 days in prison since being incarcerated.

Writing on his Facebook page on Thursday, the wealthy business, who was also the leader of the United Party for National Development (UPND), said he harboured no hate against anyone, adding that his love for his country had not changed.

Hichilema said despite the crimes that the inmates had committed, they deserved to be treated humanely, "in accordance with local and international conventions regarding the treatment of people and respect for human rights".

He said that it was even worse for those who were still look-

ing for answers as to what crimes they had committed but were "already being punished under these inhuman conditions".

Hichilema was recently charged with treason.

Authorities alleged that he blocked President Edgar Lungu's motorcade with his own convoy of vehicles during a traditional ceremony in the country's western province in April.

Egypt kills 2 Islamist militants

CAIRO - Egyptian forces shot dead two militants from the Hasam group, the government said on Friday, after the Islamist group claimed to have carried a deadly attack on police. The militants were killed in a shootout in Fayoum province, about 50km south of Cairo, as the security forces tried to arrest them at a hideout, the interior ministry said in a statement. Hasam, an extremist movement the government accuses of links to the outlawed Muslim Brotherhood, said it targeted a police convoy in the province on Thursday, killing one officer and wounding three others. News24

MP held for calling on Kenyans to take land

NAIROBI - Kenyan police on Saturday arrested a lawmaker already accused of inciting violence after he urged people to take land away from white farmers, senior officers said. Opposition deputy Mathew Lempurkel was in custody, an officer at the Naromoru station in central Kenya, told AFP by phone. "He is being questioned because of remarks he made recently asking locals to take away their land from white settlers," he added. Kenya's police chief Joseph Boinnet also confirmed in comments to Capital FM radio that Lempurkel had been arrested for "inflammatory remarks calculated to stir up racist and ethnic hatred". News24

Bombed refugee wasn't marked properly

ABUJA - Nigeria's military says the air force mistakenly launched an airstrike on a refugee camp in January because the camp was not appropriately marked as



a humanitarian base in the military's operational maps. Defence forces said in a statement that when it noticed mass movement through aerial satellite observation on Jan. 17, it was mistaken for Boko Haram activity. It called for all humanitarian activities to be marked on military ground and aerial maps, and a mandatory exchange of information to avoid future mistakes. A Borno state government official had said more than 230 people were killed when Nigeria's air force bombed multiple times the camp in Rann that was housing Boko Haram refugees. News24

Zim deploys 150 rangers, police

HWANGE - Zimbabwe has deployed 150 parks rangers, police officers and environmental clean-up personnel in the wake of the latest suspected poisoning incident in Hwange National Park, a parks spokesperson says. The deployment comes after two elephant carcasses were found by an anti-poaching patrol inside the park on Monday. "Currently we have deployed at least 150 personnel including parks, police and (members of the) Environmental Management Agency," said Tinashe Farawo, spokesperson for the state parks and wildlife management authority (Zimparks). News24

Do the right thing, EFF tells Zambia's President Lungu

CAPE TOWN - The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) has expressed concern over political developments in Zambia under the leadership of President Edgar Lungu. In a statement, the EFF said it noted with "grave concern" the "growing dictatorship and political intolerance" in the southern African country. "...Political intolerance often reflects political parties that are terrified of political contestation... the EFF had confidence in President Lungu when he had made progressive and admirable decisions to work with members of opposition party when elected in office to transform social circumstances and economic emancipation of people of Zambia." YES, I WAS WRONG ABOUT UMA - BLADE NZIMAN

JOHANNESBURG - It took SA Communist Party (SACP) General Secretary Blade Nzimande years to painstakingly admit and regret the political decisions that enabled a questionable character being elected president.

In the lead-up to the ANC's 2007 Polokwane conference, the SACP and COSATU led a campaign for President Jacob Zuma to topple former president Thabo Mbeki.

"Had we known certain things we know now, we would have acted differently.

That's what I'm prepared to say. I don't want to talk as if I'm speaking in parables, but had we known that our revolution and our struggle were going to be handed over to a immigrant Indian family going by the name of Gupta, we would have behaved differently.

"We would not have thought that Zuma was the right person to lead the ANC and to lead the alliance or the country, for that matter," he said.

Nzimande, now completely isolated from Zuma's inner circle, told City Press that he felt betrayed by Zuma's links with the Gupta family. He was disgusted at "their expectation to be handed over our SOEs [state-owned entities] and take our money to Dubai".

"Out of all families Zuma could choose," lamented Nzimande, listing a plethora of prominent families who contributed to the fight against oppression, "why associate with the Guptas?"

However, Nzimande admitted that hindsight was not an exact science. "You make choices in politics and you make mistakes along the way... The most important thing is, if you have made a mistake, identify it and be prepared to correct it," he said. He said that wrong

Zuma should have done the right thing, resigned - ANC veteran

DURBAN - President Jacob Zuma's reaction to the Nkandla debacle kick - started "the current national crisis," said ANC veteran Mavuso Msimang.

Msimang was speaking at the official launch of the Active Citizens' Movement (ACM) in Durban on Saturday.

The ANC veteran said that civil organisations have a major role to play in ensuring the country gets back on track. The Active Citizens' Movement made headlines earlier this year when it clashed with the ANC Youth League at an ACM-hosted Ahmed Kathrada memorial event. But the ACM has been mobilising since then, increasing its membership and building branches across Durban.

"ACM's mission is to actually entrench democracy. We're concerned about the fact that people have been marginalised in the new dispensation now and the fact that public officials are not accounting for positions they hold and so on. So with that in mind, it's very much democracy, a grass roots based kind of movement," said organiser of the ACM, Yousuf Vawda. Msimang told guests he and other party stalwarts had tried to advise Zuma but to no avail. "Maybe resignation is something that only white monopoly capitalists do... He would have saved this country a lot if he did the right thing and moved away.'

The ANC veteran was asked about those who are vying to take over from Zuma as ANC leader in December. "Some want to be the first female president. You ask them if they've ever visited an NGO that deals with communities and with women's issues? No one... I think I would make a much better women's president than some of the people," he said. eNCA


UNITE IN PRAYER FOR RONNIE, SAYS FAMILY

JOHANNESBURG - The family of the late Ronnie Mamoepa yesterday called on South Africans to come together in commemoration of the struggle activist and government spokesman.

"The Mamoepa family are asking the people of South Africa to join them in prayer as they come to terms with the untimely loss of Ronnie," said family spokesperson Groovin Nchabeleng in a statement.

"Ronnie Mamoepa is an icon of the country's liberation struggle having served five years of his youth in incarceration at the infamous Robben Island prison in Cape Town," he added.

Mamoepa, Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa's spokesperson, died on Saturday night at the age of 56, following complications from a stroke he suffered last month.



The family said Mamoepa had received the "highest medical care" and thanked Unitas hospital for their assistance over the last five

weeks. "The Mamoepa family also appreciates the close interest taken in Ronnie's wellbeing by the management and staff of The Presidency as well as the Minister and Deputy Minister of Health, Drs Aaron Motsoaledi and Gwen Ramakgopa."

The family also expressed appreciation for all support received from extended family, friends, colleagues and associates.

Funeral arrangements would be released shortly, said Nchabeleng.

Earlier, Ramaphosa paid tribute to Mamoepa in a statement declaring that "this is a great loss to me personally, to The Presidency and government at large," while extending his condolences to Mamoepa's wife, children and siblings.

Mamoepa, who joined government in 1994, had served in various communication roles, including as spokesman for the then Foreign Affairs Department and also home affairs.

'Kathrada's call for Zuma to resign was out of concern for ANC and SA'

SCHWEIZER RENEKE-Struggle veteran Ahmed Kathrada's call on President Jacob Zuma to resign was not made out of anger or conceit, but out of a sincere concern for the state of the African National Congress and South Africa, Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa said on Saturday.

Ramaphosa told an event to pay tribute to Kathrada in Schweizer-Reneke in the North West, where he was born on August 21, 1929.

This required not only that he challenge with all his being the iniquities of the colonial legacy and the apartheid reality. It also meant, at times, that he confront his own comrades. He could be critical without being abrasive. He could disagree without being confrontational, Ramaphosa said.

"But he felt compelled to speak out,

and to act, in defence of the values and the conduct of the movement in which he grew up and to which he dedicated his life. He never took this responsibility lightly. In a life full of 'difficult choices, we know that his decision to publicly call on President Jacob Zuma to resign his office was one of the most difficult and painful he had had to make.

"He made the call not out of anger, nor of conceit. He made the call out of a sincere concern for the state of the movement and the needs of the country. He made the call because, as a loyal and disciplined member of the African National Congress, he understood that he was a custodian of the values and practices of the movement to which he had dedicated 75 years of his life," Ramaphosa said. R2m to guard SACP bosses

JOHANNESBURG - The SA Communist Party (SACP) has, over the past five years, spent seven times more on security for its leaders across the country.

The party's financial report, which City Press has seen, shows that just less than R2m was spent on protecting the party's top brass in the year that ended in December. This compared with its last elective conference in 2012, when the party spent only R270 000 protecting its

The figure is astounding, given that the SACP has, over the course of time, found itself in financial distress and living off donations from sympathetic affiliates of labour federation COSATU. While its membership has grown over the past five years, the report shows that it is still failing to attract professionals to its ranks and that current members are not contributing to the party's

In the recent past, the party's bosses have come under fire, with some having even received death threats, as part of existing tensions with its alliance partners, the ANC and COSATU. This has forced the SACP to repeatedly beef up security for its senior leaders, including its vocal first Deputy General Secretary Solly Mapaila, who has survived hijackings and being shot at.

JOHANNESBURG - The re-opened inquest into the death of Ahmed Timol will get under way at the North Gauteng High Court today.

After Timol died, the police claimed his death was guided by a Communist Party document that encouraged activists to commit suicide rather than betray their comrades.

Died

He died in police custody 45 years ago.

states that Timol committed suicide by jumping from the 10th floor of John Vorster Square.

But, his family launched its own investigation which uncovered new evidence.

Comrades

His family, comrades and friends believe he was either pushed out the window or thrown out after being tortured to death.

The re-opened inquest heard five days of evidence in Johannesburg last month.

Among the witnesses was Dr Essop and renowned activist and lawyer George Bizos.

'A 100 000-ton message to the world'

US - President Donald Trump helped commission the USS Gerald R. Ford on Saturday and declared that the most advanced aircraft carrier to join the Navy will cause America's enemies to 'shake with fear' whenever they see its form cutting across the horizon.

"I hereby place United States Ship Gerald R Ford in commission," Trump said after delivering a speech in which he praised the US military and the American labour that went into building the 100 000 ton, \$12.9 billion warship.

"May God bless and guide this warship and all who shall sail in her," Trump said.

He was followed shortly by Susan Ford Bales, the ship's sponsor and daughter

of the 38th president, whom the ship honours.

"There is no one, absolutely no one, who would be prouder of the commissioning of this mighty ship than the president of the United States, Gerald R Ford" she said. "I am honoured to give the command, "officers and crew of the United States Gerald R Ford, man our ship and bring her to life."

And with those few words, the ship was brought to life. 'Anchors Aweigh' played and sailors who stood in formation in their crisp, white uniforms began filing off to their stations


Within minutes, the captain was informed that 'the ship is manned and ready and report for duty to the fleet.'

Trump arrived aboard the carrier's steamy flight deck by the Marine One presidential helicopter and was greeted by Defence Secretary Jim Mattis and other officials.

Trump, who visited the carrier in March to promote his plans for a military buildup, told Time magazine this year that the Navy should revert to using steam catapults to launch fighter jets because some of the state-of-the-art systems and technology aboard the USS Ford 'costs hundreds of millions of dollars more money and it's no good.'

The USS Gerald R Ford is a state-of-theart naval aircraft carrier successfully commissioned this past Saturday and is expected to take on its first mission in 2020.

It is 1 100 feet long, the length of three football fields. It is one of three naval carriers with the same design commissioned by the US Navy, including the USS John F. Kennedy (CVN 79), and the future USS Enterprise (CVN 80) costing approximately \$42 billion total. It's specialised electromagnetic systems will reportedly allow planes to take off and land more quickly. *Daily Mail*





US attorney discussed Trump campaign

WASHINGTON - Embattled US Attorney General Jeff Sessions discussed campaignrelated issues with the Russian ambassador to Washington during the presidential race something Sessions had insisted he did not do, The Washington Post reported. The paper quoted current and former administration officials who cited US intelligence intercepts of Ambassador Sergey Kislyak's accounts to his bosses in Moscow of two encounters he had with Sessions, then an adviser to Trump, during the campaign. The report is certain to add more pressure on Sessions, whose job security is seen as being in jeopardy after President Donald Trump criticised him in scathing terms in an interview this week with The New York Times, saying he was sorry he had hired him. AFP

70 villagers kidnapped in Afghanistan

KANDAHAR - 70 Afghans were abducted Friday from their village along the main highway in the south of the country, and at least seven were killed, police said, accusing the Taliban of the kidnappings. Around 30 villagers have been released but at least 30 others are still missing, Abdul Raziq, the head of Kandahar provincial police told AFP." The Taliban abducted 70 people from their house in a village along the Kandahar-Tarinkot highway, on Friday. They killed seven of them today," Raziq said. "Their bodies were found by villagers this morning." AFP

UN Security Council to meet today

UNITED NATIONS - The United Nations Security Council will meet today to discuss the bloodiest spate of Israeli -Palestinian violence for years. Sweden, Egypt



and France requested the meeting to "urgently discuss how calls for de-escalation in Jerusalem can be supported," Sweden's Deputy UN Ambassador, Carl Skau, posted on Twitter. Israel sent extra troops into the occupied West Bank on Saturday and raided the home of the Palestinian attacker who stabbed to death three Israelis on Friday, the military said. Hours before the three Israelis were stabbed, three Palestinians were killed in violence prompted by Israel's installation of metal detectors at entry points to the Noble Sanctuary-Temple Mount compound in Jerusalem's walled Old City. Reuters

Polish govt presses on with court overhaul

WARSAW - Poland's ruling party on Saturday dismissed growing concern from key allies including the EU and United States and protests at home by approving an overhaul of the Supreme Court that critics say will undermine judicial independence. As mass demonstrations continued in Polish cities, senators of the right-wing Law and Justice (PiS) party agreed in the early hours of Saturday to a Bill that would remove all Supreme Court judges, except those handpicked by the justice minister. Reuters

Crane collapse kills 7, injures 2 in Chinese

BEIJING - A crane leaned and collapsed on a construction site of a major infrastructure company in southern China, killing seven people and injuring two, authorities said yesterday. The collapse occurred late Saturday at the construction site for the southern headquarters of the state-owned China Communications Construction Co. Ltd. in the city of Guangzhou, said the city's Haizhu district. Investigators were looking into how it happened, the district said in an online statement. The company could not be reached for comment yesterday. The district said the two injured were in stable condition.

The day after he started his new job Friday, Anthony Scaramucci, a New York financier, cleared up his Twitter trail of remarks in which he differs from Trump on illegal immigration, climate change, Islam and even gun control.

"Full transparency: I'm deleting old tweets. Past views evolved and shouldn't be a distraction. I serve @POTUS agenda and that's all that matters," the new man on the White House job announced on Twitter.

A bit later, Scaramucci followed up with "the politics of 'gotcha' are over. I have thick skin and we're moving



Trump asserts all agree he has 'complete power' to pardon

WASHINGTON - President Donald Trump said on Saturday that he has "complete power" to issue pardons, an assertion that comes amid investigations into Russian interference in last year's presidential election. It was one of many topics that appeared to occupy the president's mind as the day broke.

On a day when most people are ready to forget about the issues that nagged them during the week, Trump revved up. In an early morning flurry of 10 tweets, he commented about pardons, former presidential rival Hillary Clinton, son Don Jr., health care, the USS Gerald Ford, the attorney general and other issues.

Trump said in one of his 10 messages: "While all agree the U.S. President has the complete power to pardon, why think of that when only crime so far is LEAKS against us.

The Washington Post recently reported that Trump has inquired about the authority he has as president to pardon aides, relatives or even himself in connection with the widening investigation into Russian interference in the election and whether any Trump associates were involved.

The president has long criticised leaks of information about the investigation, and has urged authorities to prosecute leakers. AP

Popularity tumbles for France's Macron - poll

PARIS - A poll out yesterday shows the popularity rating of France's new President Emmanuel Macron has slumped 10 points to hit 54 per cent over the past month.

While Macron has made a strong start on the world stage and won a solid majority in Parliament, his first three months in power have not been completely trouble-free.

He was widely criticised by opponents and the press as heavy-handed after a row over budget cuts that ended with the resignation of a highly-regarded military chief.

The 39-year-old leader has also backed a controversial Bill to toughen France's security laws that includes measures some rights groups have branded as draconian.

Draw

His majority in Parliament has drawn concern, with opponents and several newspapers expressing concern over the concentration of power in the presidency.

According to an Ifop poll carried out for Journal du Dimanche newspaper, the number of French people satisfied with his performance fell 10 points from 64 per cent

Macron's Prime Minister Edouard Philippe marked an eight point drop to hit 56 per cent of French people happy with him, said the poll of 1 947 adults carried out last week.

France's youngest-ever president, who has sought to project an image of authority since taking office in May, made clear during the row with the military boss that he would brook no insubordination as commander-in-chief.

The leftist Liberation newspaper said Macron's "little authoritarian fit" could be a sign he was drunk on power and said it was time for him "to grow up a bit";

US TO BAN AMERICANS FROM TRAVELLING TO NORTH KOREA

WASHINGTON - The Trump administration will ban American citizens from travelling to North Korea, US officials said on Friday, following the death of university student Otto Warmbier who died in June after falling into a coma in a North Korean prison.

Secretary of State Rex Tillerson had decided to impose "geographical travel restriction" for North Korea, the officials said, which would make

it illegal to use US passports to enter the country. They said the restriction would be published in the Federal Register next week and will take effect 30 days after that.

The officials were not authorised to publicly discuss the decision before it is announced and spoke on condition of anonymity. Two tour operators that organise group trips to North Korea said they had already been informed of the decision.

It wasn't clear how many Americans the move will effect, as figures about how many Americans go to North Korea are difficult for even the US government to obtain. The US strongly warns Americans against travelling to North Korea, but has not until now prohibited it despite other sanctions targeting the country.

Americans who venture there typically travel from China, where several tour groups market trips to adventure-seekers.

Barring Americans from stepping foot in North Korea marks the latest US step to isolate the furtive, nuclear-armed nation, and protect US citizens who may be allured by the prospect of travelling there. Nearly all Americans who have gone to North Korea have left without incident. But some have been seized and given draconian sentences for seemingly minor offences. AP





BARCA TRIO WANTS EYMAR TO STAY

BARCELONA - Barcelona have brought out their biggest guns in the battle to keep Neymar with Lionel Messi, Luis Suarez and Gerard Pique all launching attempts to convince him to reject Paris Saint-Germain.

The Ligue 1 outfit have told Neymar they are willing to meet his €222million (£196m) release clause and have offered him a staggering wage worth over £500 000 per week after tax.

Barcelona president Josep Bartomeu has already tried and failed to convince Neymar to stay but, according to Mundo Deportivo, his attacking team-mates Messi and Suarez are trying to do the

The Spanish newspaper claims Messi and Suarez have already addressed the reports with Neymar at their pre-season training camp in New Jersey while it also says Pique had a particularly 'intense' exchange with the wantaway forward.

It comes as Bartomeu told reporters that Barcelona were staying 'calm' over reports that they could lose their second biggest star this summer.

Indeed, Marca state that PSG may have got ahead of themselves with

regards to Neymar, suggesting they will struggle to overcome Financial Fair Play regulations if they sign him.

To activate the clause, PSG must pay the entire transfer fee up front and are believed to be seeking sponsorship from Oatar to make sure the figures stack up, but it is far from a simple process.

On Saturday, Neymar reminded the Nou Camp executives of exactly what they would be losing if the deal did go through as he scored twice in a glamorous friendly tie against Juventus to win the game 2-1.

Barcelona are also attempting to sign Liverpool star Philippe Coutinho in an £72m deal, hoping that the arrival of one of Neymar's closest friends will convince him to remain at the club.

SA swimmers struggle

Women's tennis in the doldrums

JOHANNESBURG-Serena Williams' pregnancy has left the sport in a fragile state, with no clear leader ready to step up and fill the berth.

Eighteen-time Grand Slam winner Chris Evert summed it up succinctly when she recently told ESPN: "I think at the top of the game, it's very chaotic right now. I think there's a lot of fragility.'

This is the result of former world No 1 Serena Williams taking time away from the sport to have a baby.

Since she bowed out after winning the Australian Open when she was five weeks pregnant in January, women's tennis has had a topsy-turvy ride, with different players winning titles and changing the top position.

Since then, world No 6 Ukrainian Elina Svitolina has won four titles, and Russian world No 17 Anastasia Pavlyuchenkova has bagged two.

The pair are the only players who have managed multiple titles since Williams' temporary exit.

The other winners have became onehit wonders, failing to keep their momentum.

Three of the titles won by Svitolina are not ranked in the top-three category of international tournaments.

Out of the four, only the Italian Open is ranked as one of the five premier events on the 2017 Women's Tennis Association (WTA) tour.

Pavlyuchenkova's titles - the Morocco Open and the Monterrey Open - are ranked far below the Grand Slams.

The second Grand Slam of the year, the French Open, was won by unseeded Jelena Ostapenko of Latvia.

The Wimbledon title was taken by Spaniard Garbiñe Muguruza, which Women tennis title winners since Serena Williams went on maternity leave

The Blues had dreamed of signing both at the start of the summer but with PSG making a huge effort to get the Chilean they will focus on the teenager.

MANCHESTER - Manchester City will step up their pursuit of Monaco's Kylian Mbappe if they cannot ward off Paris Saint-Germain's rival interest in Alexis Sanchez, Goal understands.

JOHANNESBURG - A number of Serbian coaches have made a mark in South African football.

Some arrived as unknowns and left empty-handed, while others left a lasting legacy. Kosta Papic and Vladimir Vermezovic share the distinction of having coached Kaizer Chiefs and Orlando Pirates.

Lukaku has started life under Mourinho well, scoring twice in two friendlies including a strike against their Premier League rivals City in a 2-0 win, but he will be one of the first to be scrutinised if the team fail to challenge for the Premier League title.

While Mourinho's team won the League Cup and Europa League last season, there was concern from fans that the style of football was not in-keeping with tradition as they drew 10 of their 19 Premier League homes games.

Having lost top scorer Zlatan Ibrahimovic, Lukaku will be tasked with repeating the feats both he and the Swede achieved last year -both registered over 25 goals in all competitions for their respective clubs. *Daily Mail*


FAF was the difference for Proteas - Chappell


goalkeeper Khanyakezwe Shabalala. It was rather an impressive showing from the MTN Premier League rookies as they managed to beat Mbombela United in the
