

A visa is an endorsement placed withn a passport that grants the holder offiial permission to enter, leave or stay a country for a specified period.

The most common visa types are tourist, tudent, work and transit wisas.

Depending on where your are travelng, a visa can be valid for a single or nultiple visits. Some visas require an pplication to be filed prior to entering he country and other visas are granted pon entering the country

Certain countries require an interview or medical screening prior to applying or a visa. This is different from a pass-

A passport is used to verify one's country of citizenship. If travelling outside your country, it is used to regain entry into your country of citizenship. Passports include a photo, name, birth date, gender and physical characteristics of the

Some countries only require a passport for re-entry. Other countries may require a visa before entry. One should confirm if a visa is required before traveling to a certain country.

Diplomats and government officials are granted different passports than what's given to regular travelers.

A visa in this country can only be issued to certain tourists, business visitors, and certain foreign volunteer workers. The documents can be obtained at the ministry of home affairs headquarin Mbabane and the country's forga mission:

Pay E85 to change surname

IF you contemplate changing your surname, you should have E85 ready to ensure that such happens.

This is contained in the government services directory, aimed at informing the public about the kinds of services offered by government.

The services are obtainable at the ministry of home affairs in Mbabane. There are no specific requirements for this service, except for the E85.

The E85 includes E50, which is needed for an alteration of the applicant's birth certificate.

The remaining E35 is for the alteration of the national identity card (ID). The duration of the service varies depending on the merits of a case.

Get ID within 3 days

IF you want a national identity card, government promises you that you will get it within three working days.

The first issue of the ID costs E25 and the service is available for Swazi citizens and legally registered foreigners. If the ID is lost, an applicant would be required to fork out

Below are the requirements for a person who wants an ID:

- Must be 16 years and above.
- Certified copy of birth certificate
- Graded tax number, if male and above 18
- Valid resident/working permit for non-Swazi.

Below are requirements for someone whose ID is lost:

- Police report proving that ID is lost.
- Documents proving legality of alteration (if altering ID).

Pay up to E68 to deliver a baby

DELIVERING a baby can cost up to E68 in government health facilities.

However, the costs can even be less, depending on each case as some could not be so complicated.

The fees include the caesarean section fee, which is E25, normal vaginal delivery (E5), stitches if necessary during normal vaginal delivery (E15), ward fee per night (E6), medication (E2), and outpatient department (E20).

The service is provided by the ministry of health and is available to all pregnant women.

The women, before accessing the services, should have tangible signs of labour pains. They should also have their ID cards with them before they could access the services.

The services are accessed in all government hospitals and clinics in all the four regions of the country. The duration of the service varies from case to case.

Expect Standard V results anytime - Minister

THE Minister of Education and Training Phineas Magagula has assured parents and pupils anticipating the Swaziland Primary Certificate results to relax as they will be released before the end of December 31 or possibly today.

In a telephonic interview with the minister, he said the results would be published in newspapers before the year ends.

"I cannot however state the exact day as we (ministry) are also waiting for a correspondent from the Examination Council of Swaziland (ECOS)," he stated.

Magagula requested parents and pupils who are anxiously waiting for their results to be patient as the results will be out soon. He said as soon as they get a correspondent from the council, they will take the results to Cabinet for blessing before

He said he was still to talk to the council to get full details of the results release date.

"I need to contact the council so I can be in a position to state the exact date," he stated.

The localised Swaziland Primary Certificate (SPC), popularly known



as Grade Seven results, in previous years were released after Christmas while the Junior Certificate results were released during the first few weeks of the New Year.

Whereas Form Five results are usually the last to be released and it is normally done towards the end of January of the following year, which in this case, means they will be released by the end of January 2018. Last year, the Swaziland Primary Certificate (SPC) examinations results were released on December 30, 2016 which was on a Friday while Form Three results were released on January, 2017.

Swazi Observer Managing Editor Mbongeni Mbingo said in the event the results are released today or any other time, readers must rest assured that this newspaper will publish them in a bigger font as usual.

He advised readers to watch the space and put trust in the Swazi Observer.

SRA VOTE FOR WAYA KIND OF STR

STRIKING Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) employees have made it clear that they are not willing to go back to work until they get the 6.5 per cent increment and housing allowance they are demanding.

This effectively means the workers have employed the waya waya approach as regards the strike.

This decision by the employees was reached yesterday by members of Swaziland Revenue Workers Union (SRAWU) during a meeting held at Shosholoza Centre in Manzini.

The employees decided to turn down SRA's offer to go back to work and report for duty by 10am yesterday and continue with negotiations while at work.

The workers had been locked out by management and further slapped with a no work-no-pay rule after engaging in a strike that has lasted for two weeks.

During the meeting which was attended by throngs of SRA employees, it surfaced that there were members who heeded to the memo issued by SRA Commissioner General Dumisane Masilela.

The memo advised striking workers to report back to work before 10am yesterday.

However, according to SRAWU Secretary General Moses Masilela out of the hundreds of workers who are under SRAWU only 10 members reported back to work, seven at Ngwenya Border Gate while Mananga saw three heeding the call.

ipated that by opening doors to workers maybe a lot of them would go back to work.

Workers

However, SRA's Vusi Dlamini said their records indicate that 21 workers returned to work. Breaking it down, Dlamini said 15 are based in the various border gates, Mananga (seven), Ngwenya (four), Mahamba (three) and Lavumisa one. The other six are from the headquarters and other branches.

Those who went back to work were labelled as traitors by their colleagues. Masilela when updating the members on the progress of the negotiations said nothing had changed as the employer was not offering them anything which is why they

decided to get back to members to find another way forward.

Masilela said the only thing that happened was that they were sent to CMAC on Wednesday where they did not receive any help but wasted the whole day for nothing.

On the issue of being locked out and not receiving their salaries, the workers wondered if it was proper for the employer to execute a lockout and then when workers respect that order, the employer hits them with the no work no pay tactic.

Masilela said as SRA employees they have compromised too much and this time even if the 6.5 per cent and housing allowance demand is met they will go back to work but that will only be the

...SRAWU seeks advice from NAPSAWU

SRAWU has already engaged the National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU).

Yesterday SRAWU Secretary General Moses Masilela informed members that as leadership they have already approached NAPSAWU and asked for advice on the predicament the workers are faced with.

Masilela said NAPSAWU informed them that their offices were always open. Some members even suggested that since the work no pay issue will hit hard on their pockets maybe SRAWU leadership can approach NAPSAWU or SNAT and request a loan on behalf of members.

The members said in terms of rates

these unions could offer competitive rates as compared to banks. Masilela said there were options they would look into as workers will be on strike.

He said workers could approach banks and ask for a deferment in terms of debts as they have a month with no pay. An example, teachers from Lesotho who engaged in a strike for eight months and were later hit with a no work no pay, are said to have received a deferment of those months. SRA employees are currently engaged in a strike action demanding a 6.5 per cent salary increment on top of the 6.8 per cent already offered by the authority and also demanding housing allowance.

Are Tax returns piling up at SRA?

AS the workers are on strike it has been alleged that work is piling up at the SRA offices as tax returns are piling up with no one to do reports.

The workers have vowed that they will not be doing December's work unless SRA is willing to pay them for that month.

The workers said if SRA's contingency plan worked then it means there will be no loads of work when they finally go back.

Building Society runs to court in bid to stop looming strike

IN a bid to stop a looming strike action by its employees, Building Society has run to court where they have filed an urgent application for an order interdicting the employees from continuing with the industrial action.

The Swaziland Building Society in its papers filed in court and already served to the Swaziland Union of Financial Institutions and Allied Workers Union (SUFIAWU) argues that the industrial action which the employees want to engage in is illegal.

They are seeking an order of court interdicting the Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) from conducting an intended balloting exercise where employees of the institution are expected to vote on whether the strike action should be on or not. 

MANZINI COPS ALLEGEDLY SELLING FAKE DRIVERS' LICENCES AT E2 500

IS this a tip of the iceberg? Some corrupt traffic police officers based at the Manzini Police Station are allegedly selling counterfeit drivers' licences to members of the public at a cost of E2 500.

This startling revelation has been made by a woman who was arrested by Mbabane traffic police officers on Wednesday after she was found driving a motor vehicle without a valid drivers licence.

Hloniphile Gule, who is in her mid-40s, was nabbed by the men in blue while driving a Toyota sedan at Forbes Reef.

When the traffic cops stopped and requested her to produce a drivers licence, she fished out from her bag, a fake document and showed it to one of the police offi-

The uncompromising traffic officers informed her that they were not satisfied that this was a valid drivers' licences and requested her to accompany them to the police station.

The officers's uspicions were confirmed when the document was checked and discovered not to be available in the system containing all valid and legitimate drivers' licenses in the country.

Gule was then arrested and charged.

According to the charge sheet which was read to her in court yesterday morning, Gule was charged with unlawfully and intentionally driving a motor vehicle on a public road using a counterfeit drivers licence.

On the second count, she was charged with unlawfully and intentionally driving a road-unworthy motor vehicle on a public road which had smooth tyres.

Gule appeared before Mbabane Principal

Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi yesterday who asked her why she was driving on the country's roads with a fake drivers' licence.

That was when she dropped the bombshell and exposed the unscrupulous traffic cops

Gule informed the court that she obtained the document from a traffic police officer in Manzini in 2003 after paying him E2 500 in hard cash.

"Your Worship, I was not aware that the document was fake. I started driving lessons in 2003 and after a few months, my driving instructor said I was now ready to get a drivers licence. He took me and four others to the Manzini Police Station where we met a traffic police officer. The officer instructed all four of us to give him E2 500 each and wait outside the police station," she

Gule said the offi-

cer disappeared into the building and returned a few minutes later with the drivers licences for all four of them. Magistrate Nhlabatsi, who was visibly perplexed by the accused's revelation, asked her how she knew that the person they gave money to was actually a police officer.

"The person was clad in full police uniform and I have no doubt in my mind that he, was indeed a cop. Also, he emerged from the police station building to meet us and further disappeared into the same building after taking the money," she said.

As the accused person made this disclosure, traffic police officers who were also inside court yesterday cringed in obvious embarrassment and constantly glanced at one another.

The magistrate asked Gule if she had paid for the driving lessons before paying the E2 500 to the traffic cop and she answered to the affirmative.

She said she had paid E 1 800 for the driving lessons.

"Before you were arrested, were you

aware that the transaction you entered into with the police officer was illegal?" asked the presiding officer.

Gule answered to the negative.

"I wasn't aware it was an illegal deal. I just saw a cop in uniform and thought everything was legitimate. My driving instructor was also there, so I had no reason to believe there was something amiss," she said.

Gule pleaded guilty to the offence and continued pleading for leniency, based on her claim

that she was not aware that she was in possession of a fake document. This means that for 14 years, Gule has been driving along the country's roads with a fake licence without being aware of it.

Magistrate Nhlabatsi found her guilty as charged and sentenced her to one year imprisonment with a fine option of E2000.

The sentence was however suspended for a period of one year on condition she is not found guilty of a similar offence. On the charge of driving a motor vehicle with smooth tyres, she was sentenced to five months imprisonment with a fine option of E500.

Ruling on Hunter drone case in next session

A ruling in an application for acquittal and discharged filed by Private Investigator Hunter Shongwe in his drone case will be issued in the next session of the High Court.

Judge Cyril Maphanga is yet to make the ruling after Shongwe had been put to his defense by his Lawyer Derrick Jele who applied that Shongwe be acquitted and discharged on the criminal matter.

Shongwe will then know whether his application for discharge is successful of not after the ruling.

The application for his discharge in terms of Section 174 (4) of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act (CPE) was filed after the crown had closed its case.

The section reads, "If at the close of the case for the prosecution, the court considers that there is no evidence that the accused committed the offence charged with or any other offence of which he might not be convicted thereon it may acquit and discharge him."

According to papers filed by Jele before court, the decision to grant or refuse such an application lies with the discretion of the court.

Jele had submitted that the evidence led by the crown was poor, such that the accused ought not to have been charged in the first place which follows therefore that Shongwe has to be discharged at the close of the crown's case as there is no need to put him to defence.

During trial the crown paraded nine witnesses which included, staffers from the Swaziland Civil Aviation Authority (SWACAA), the police and the members of the Ezulwini inner council.

Jele had further submitted that the evidence of John Vilakati, Ndlavela Mavimbela, Desmond Dlamini and Clement Sihlongonyane in the last count of contravening the Swazi Administration Act on 1950 were not controverted that the accused failed or refused to appear before the Ezulwini Royal Kraal.

Jele stated that the issue in court was whether that is a criminal offence in terms of the Swazi

Administration Act and further the evidence of the Act clearly shows that it was repealed hence there was no need to then charge the accused on a repealed legislation.

On the other counts one to four which were that of contravening the Civil Aviation Regulations, Jele submitted that the prosecution parade d three

wit-

nesses, Simo Shongwe, Simon Kutibiwa and Clement Sihlongonyane in order to prove that the accused operated an aircraft that is classified under the first schedule of Regulation 117 of 2011.

"It is our submission that the prosecution through its witnesses failed dismally to prove that and it follows that the accused person has to be discharged at this early stage," Jele stated in his papers.

The pilotless aircraft, according to Jele is not classified in the first schedule of the Regulation and if not it follows therefore that it cannot, be registered nor have an airworthiness certificate.

The first schedule of the regulation also does not refer to remotely piloted aircraft, unnamed aerial vehicle or drone and the accused has been charged for operating a pilotless aircraft which is not covered under the first schedule of the Regulation 117 of 2011 and there is no regulation in Swaziland according Jele with reference to drones.

Shongwe pleaded not guilty to all five counts when they were put to him during trial and that of contravening the Swaziland Administration Order by allegedly failing, refusing or neglecting to appear before the Ezulwini Umphakatsi when called to answer certain issues regarding his forceful stay as a tenant in his office.

The private investigator is facing a total of five counts in that on the first count he is charged with contravening Section 3 (1) of the Civil Aviation Regulations in that he allegedly piloted a drone while at Mvutjini without being a holder of a valid civil aviation licence.

On the second count, Shongwe is alleged to have contravened Section 59 (1) of the regulations in that he flew the same drone in the Swaziland Air Space and thus flouted the Convention of International Aviation.

Shongwe on the third count is charged with contravening Section 54 of the Civil Aviation Regulations in that while at Mvutjini, he flew the same drone without being a holder of an Aircraft Certificate while on the fourth count he is alleged to have contravened Section 60(1) of the same regulations in

that he flew a pilotless aircraft.

Shongwe reported the drone missing while flying in the direction of Somhlolo National Stadium during Easter Services in 2012 where the League of Churches had descended for the annual services and he had claimed it costs in the region of E20 000,

Charges laid against Pastor Mboro, but he hits back at critics

JOHANNESBURG - Controversial Pastor Paseka "Mboro" Motsoeneng has slammed his critics after assault and intimidation charges were laid against him, following the death of a three-year-old at his church this past weekend.

Mboro helped Nontombi Gwam, 42, to lay charges of assault and culpable homicide against Ekurhuleni emergency services personnel on Wednesday after her daughter Latoya died at the church last Sunday.

Mboro was accused of assaulting one of the paramedics and they laid the charges against him on the same day.

But he has defended himself, speaking out against critics, including the Commission for the Promotion and Protection of Cultural, Religious and Linguistic Communities (CRL Rights Commission) who criticised him on Wednesday. Commission Chairperson Thoko Mkhwanazi-Xaluva said: "It is not for the religious leader to encourage people

to bring people to them who are extremely ill. Churches are not supposed to be hospitals."

Mboro responded yesterday and questioned the point of the statement.

"Everybody knows that the church in

general is not a hospital, so I wonder what the point of that statement was. I urge the CRL to read the statement of the late Latoya's mother before making any remarks," he said. "Everybody, including members of the CRL, need both prayer and medication if they so require," Mboro said. He said he was aware of the charges against him and had made representations to the prosecutor in the matter.

However, of greater concern was the state of the medical profession in the country, he said.

"We must never lose sight of the fact that an innocent three-year-old child Latoya lost her life because of the negligence of the paramedics," he said.

"After much discussion with the mother of the late Latoya and her family, she requested that I lodge a call for all people that have been traumatised by medical personnel or paramedics, to come forward and complain so that their complaints can be investigated," Mboro said.

Royal Swaziland Police (RSP) but they would be required to submit forms from police services of the two countries.

RFM distances itself from nurse's Facebook post

THE Raleigh Fitkin Memorial (RFM) Hospital has disassociated itself from a Facebook post by one Celiwe Magongo who claims to be a nurse at the hospital.

In wake of the new list making rounds on social media Celiwe Magongo who is at the top of the list has been involved in a showdown with one Meluleki 'Sluga' Simelane who discredited her and said she did not deserve to be on the list because he alleged that she lived off other people.

In her post Magongo also stated that in the event Simelane failed to apologise, he ran the risk of being attacked by her relatives and finding himself in a surgical ward which she is stationed at.

"We are a service provider and our primary service is to afford members of the public with health care so we refuse to be associated with statements implying that our nurses can at any point use our facilities to push their agend as that go against our mandate which is to provide health care," he said.

The CEO added that they strongly condemned what the nurse had done in bringing the hospital's name into the post to fight personal bat-

"We condemn such because it brings the hospital's name into disrepute. We therefore will conduct an investigation into the matter and that investigation will inform us on the next appropriate move," he said.

Simelane assured users of the RFM facilities that they were committed to giving them the best services possible.

Strong Rand to drive petrol price down in new year

JOHANNESBURG - Motorists can expect some relief as fuel prices are expected to drop in the new year.

According to the Automobile Association, fuel prices are set for a hefty drop after the Rand's strong performance against the US dollar.

This is despite increases in international petroleum prices during December.

The association was commenting on the price drop based on unaudited month-end fuel data released by the Central Energy

"The Rand has had a very strong run against the Dollar since the middle of the month, gaining considerable ground after the ANC's electoral conference chose Cyril Ramaphosa as the new leader of the party," the AA said.

"After opening the month at R13.80 to the Dollar, the rand is now testing the

R12.30 level, and that despite higher international oil prices over December, all grades of fuel are set to fall at the Department of Energy's next price adjustment.

Petrol was expected to drop by up to 34 cents a litre, diesel by 26 cents and illuminating paraffin by 28 cents.

"... Ramaphosa's political and fiscal position ahead of the February 2018 budget speech is likely to be the most influential determining factor for fuel price movements in the short term," the AA added. eNCA

Teen stabs man at The Gables

A man is lucky to be alive after he was stabbed in the head with a knife by a teenage boy at The Gables Shopping Complex.

The teenager has since been arrested and charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm (GBH).

Khetsa Nxumalo attacked and stabbed Thomas Nkambule in broad daylight at the Ezulwini based shopping area on November 4, 2017.

Yesterday morning, he made an appearance before Mbabane Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi and pleaded guilty of the offence. He has also been granted bail fixed at E2 000.

However, he has not been able to pay the bail amount.

Yesterday, the prosecution applied that the accused person be remanded back into custody until January 5, 2018 since it intended leading witnesses to prove the commission of the offence.

Soon after the presiding officer had issued the remand order, Nxumalo raised his hand and requested to address the court.

"Your Worship, I wish to make an application for reduction of the bail amount because I am currently in custody since I cannot afford it," he said.

The prosecution vehemently opposed this application and submitted that the offence Nxumalo was accused of was very serious.

"We are opposing the application for reduction of the bail amount on the basis of the nature of the weapon that was used in the commission of the offence and the body part in which the victim was stabbed. The head is a very delicate part of the body," submitted the prosecutor.

Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi accordingly dismissed the application and remanded Nxumalo into custody.

Meanwhile, in a separate matter, a man surprised the court and the public gallery when he claimed to be mentally unfit to stand trial.

Menzi Mavimbela had come to

court for the continuation of his trial but discovered that the docket for his case had not been brought to

Magistrate Nhlabatsi asked the accused person why he considered himself to be mentally unfit.

"My sister, I am actually not sick but the problem is that I frequently visit a certain local rehab centre because I smoke and drink too much. Ngule yonje inkinga lenginayo my sister," he said as the public gallery reverberated into laughter.

"I am not your sister. You need to address me as Your Worship," the presiding officer quickly reminded him. His case was stood down to allow the prosecution time to look for and find the docket.

Maphungwane residents challenge police to make 'proper investigations'

RESIDENTS of Maphungwane are not happy about reports which suggest that the man who was found lying dead near homesteads at Mhlabubovu area died as a result of an accident.

The residents challenge police to undertake a thorough investigation to unearth the real cause of the man's death.

Apparently, a man in his late 20s was found by residents of the area in the early hours of Saturday.

The man's upper body had multiple cuts which suggested that he was dragged on the ground for several kilometres before being dumped near the homesteads where the body was eventually found.

Police have also confirmed information which was to the effect that the man was dragged by a motor vehicle for about six kilometres. It was gathered that the man was first hit by a kombi near Mafasitelo area, which did not stop after the accident. This was late in the evening last Friday. It is said that later in the same evening, another vehicle which operates as a For Hire ran over the man who was already motionless dragging him on the ground for over six kilometres.

At least, this is the information which the police have confirmed to be working on. However, residents of the area have vigorously refused to accept such information as they are of the view that there is more to the matter. A resident who identified himself as Maziya said this was mainly because the body was found at an area where the farming of dagga is rife.

According to Maziya, the incident could be somehow be linked with gang fights which often emanates from the cultivation of dagga.

"Some gangs from around this area fight and accuse each other for stealing dagga in the fields; and therefore police must intensify their investigation and see if this case cannot be linked with such," said Maziya. Maziya based his argument on the fact that it could not be possible for an experienced driver to drag a human body for over six kilometres without noticing. Several other residents have shared the same sentiments as they call for intensified investigations.

MAN BREAKS INTO SHOPS, STEALS CLOTHING AND CA

CASES of breaking into shops with the intent to steal continue to be a nightmare to businesspeople operating in Siteki as more cases are reported almost every month.

A recent case is said to have occurred last week wherein a boutique shop was broken into, and items valued at over E4 000 were stolen.

The accused person stated that he had already used the money which he stole on alcohol. Some of the clothing items are said to have been recovered from other people to whom the accused person had sold to.

JAILED FOR BASHING WIFE WITH SAGILA

A 53-year-old man has been sentenced to three years behind bars for bashing his wife with a knobker sig-(sagila) on the head.

Sipho Phungwayo of Siphocosimunder Chief Jabhane stood trial at the Manhane Magistrate's Court yesterday morraing and, according to the charge the did wrongfully and unlawfully assault Mavis Dlamini with a knobkernic on the head and with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

The incident happened at Signageni. Phungwayo pleaded guilty to the offence.

In his defence, he informed Manustrate Sifiso Vilakati that he did not intend bashing his wife but she provoked and insulted him.


He said his wife was the one with dirst charged at him with the knobkerrice and a fight ensured.

The aging Phungwayo said there was a scuffle as he tried to dispossess his wife of the weapon and, in the midst of the fight, the knobkerrie accidentally hit her on the head.

It is said after the assault, Phungwayo went to a nearby homestead and ported what had happened to one Nambile Lokotfwako.

The prosecution however, disputed Phungwayo's defence and required the court to reject it.

"We respectfully plead with the court to disregard the accused person's defence as a lie based on the nature of the watpon that was used in the commission of the offence. The medical report also imdicates that the victim's injuries are wery serious and there is no way they could have been inflicted through an aucidental act. The accused person committed the offence in manifestation of a wellthought intention," submitted the

prosecutor. In delivering his judgment, Magistrate Vilakati said he considered Phungwayo's mitigation and the fact that he had children with the victim

"However, the seriousness of the offence committed cannot be overlooked. Cases of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm are prevalent in our courts where men assault their spouses.

These domestic violence cases are prevalent in our society.

In some instances, the victims get severely injured and eventually lose their lives.

It is in light of the foregoing that our courts should strongly frown upon accused persons who commit such offences and discourage men from assaulting their spouses," he said.

The presiding officer further warned Phungwayo against assaulting his wife and said it was improper to raise children within an environment where violence is a daily occurrence.

"You could have killed the mother of your children," he said.

Phungwayo was then found guilty as charged and sentenced to three years imprisonment or a fine option of E3

Man killed, 'dumped' near former MP's home

IN a tragic incident which has left residents of Maphungwane making speculations, a defaced man was found lying dead near a homestead belonging to a former member of Parliament in the early hours of Saturday.

The gruesome discovery was made by residents of the area who were returning from their various destinations just after midnight.

Even though the incident is said to have since developed a number of different versions, one fact remains that the man was dragged by a motor vehicle for several kilometres before being deposited near the homestead which is situated adjacent to two other homesteads and a school. The body was found in the middle of a road which passes through the homesteads to other areas.

Upon discovering the body, the residents are said to have raised an alarm, to which community police responded swift-

A source close to the matter said it became apparent that the man was actually dead as his face was ripped open to one side, with numerous fractures on the limbs and an extensively damaged upper body.

The community police guarded the body until dawn while waiting for police to arrive. In the meantime, more residents of the area gathered at the scene to identify the man, an exercise which however proved futile as the man's face was extensively damaged.

"One thing which became evident was that the man had been dragged on the ground for a long distance, presumably with a motor vehicle," said a source.

Police are said to have arrived a few hours later taking the body to Good Shepherd Hospital.

Statements were also recorded from several residents who are said to have given different versions of the incident.

Primarily, the residents are said to have been of the view that the man had been murdered.

"What came to mind was that the man was likely to have been killed for whatever reasons, before being dragged by a vehicle which then deposited the body near the said homesteads.

Our understanding was that the body had been strategically deposited there so as to give an impression that the homesteads situated nearby were responsible for the gruesome incident," said another resident.

One arrested in connection with the man's death

AT least one suspect has since been arrested in connection with the death of a man who was found lying dead near homesteads at Maphungwane, police have reported.

Chief Police Communications Officer Khulani Mamba confirmed the discovery of a man who was found with multiple injuries which suggested that he had been dragged with a motor vehicle before being strategically deposited near the homesteads.


Mamba said however, police have information to the effect that the incident was all an accident, at least for now.

He disclosed that one motorist is currently in the custody of police as the matter is being investigated further.

"For now we have one suspect in our custody; who however alleges that he accidentally dragged the body of a dead man away from the area where it was eventually found," said Mamba.

He stated that investigations were however continuing.

Meanwhile, independent information gathered by this publication was to the effect that the



man was hit by a kombi near Mafasitelo area, which left him lying there as it did not stop after the alleged accident.

This is approximately seven kilometres away from where the body was eventually found.

The arrested motorist therefore alleges to have accidentally dragged the body of the man without realising anything wrong.

This is information which has however been dismissed as impractical by other motorists.

"It is not possible for a driver to drag a foreign object as big as a human being for such a long distance without noting something wrong with the vehicle," said a taxi driver.

'Minister should deal with farm dweller evictions'

ONLY the minister, not Shiselweni Farm Dwellers' Tribunal can issue an order for evictions of farm dwellers at Mahamba Gorge.

These are submissions that have been made by Mahamba Gorge farm dwellers who face eviction following an order that was issued by the Shiselweni Farm Dwellers Tribunal and Central Farm Dwellers Tribunal.

These submissions are contained in an affidavit in an urgent application for an interdict against eviction filed at the High Court by the farm dwellers

According to Mandla Shongwe in his affidavit, the respondent (Mahamba Gorge) has been trying to evict him and other families in the farm after lodging an application with the Shiselweni District Farm Dwellers Association where it was successful as an order was made to have them vacate the farm by June 30, 2017.

Shongwe submitted that they are protected by the Farm Dwellers Act in particular Section 10 (2) which prohibits the evictions between September 1, 2017 and May 31, 2018 and the fact that the minister for tourism is yet to decide their fate in terms of the Act.

He submitted that the balance of con-

venience favoured that the respondent be interdicted until due process is observed and the minister has made his final decision.

Farm dwellers residing at Mahamba have taken the Mahamba Gorge (Pty) Limited to court where they are seeking an order interdicting, restraining the Gorge directors from demolishing their structures at their homesteads.

The Mbondzane Farm Dwellers in an affidavit filed by Mandla Shongwe are also seeking an order of court interdicting the Gorge owners or their agents against setting foot anywhere near 10metres from their homesteads situated on Portion A of Farm Johanesloop Number 19 which Shongwe claimed he has been in occupation ever since he was born.

Shongwe also submitted in his affidavit that they are seeking an order restraining Mahamba Gorge

from ploughing on their fields and must also erect their demolished cattle Farm dwellers

Shongwe whose affidavit was supported by that of Bonsile Nhleko submitted that he is the Mahamba Gorge umnumzane in terms of the Farm Dwellers Control Act having resided there since he was born.

He stated that the respondent has been seeking to evict all of them from the farm and as such proceeded to demolish their gardens, kraals and fencing.

"As a result of the destruction that occurred, my sweet potatoes, beans and maize I had planted therein were all devoured by cattle, I witnessed that occurring as I was drawn to the act by the driver who was chasing after onlookers with the TLB machine," he sub-

He stated that he has a clear right conferred by Section 10(2) of the Farm Dwellers Act to the effect that he shall not be removed or evicted between the said period.

He said there was no other satisfactory remedy available to them except to interdict the respondent from evicting him and the other farm dwellers through the

He submitted that the matter was urgent in that the respondent may effect the demolishing any time as it has been done to other families.

The matter has been filed under a certificate of urgency through their Lawyer Bhekiwe Ngwenya before High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze.

I'm not the father of dumped baby - accused's husband

THE husband of the woman who is accused of dumping her new born baby to die at a mountain has denied fathering the child.

The husband who could only be identified as Shongwe said his wife Magagula separated from him nine months ago.

During this time of separation Magagula fell pregnant with the child that was eventually dumped at a mountain to die at Ekuvinjelweni

Speaking to this publication, sources said the mother of the deceased baby, Magagula is suspected to have been involved in an affair when she was cast out of her marital homestead nine months ago.

"Information we have gathered is that Magagula and her husband Shongwe were separated amidst rumours of cheating, so the husband told his wife to go and live at her nearby parental homestead. During this time, Magagula was then impregnated by another man," said the source.

Negotiations

About eight months later, Shongwe then reopened negotiations with his now pregnant wife and asked her to come back to the homestead as he was about to leave on work relat-

It is then when a pregnant Magagula was seen back at her marital homestead for only a week, after that she disappeared for another whole week returning without the baby. This then shocked the husband who then

phoned the police who made the arrest. "After the arrest, Magagula then led the police up the mountain where her new born baby had died after spending three days alone,"

Attempts to get other family members proved said the source.

COP'S SUPERVISOR ASSAULTS JUNIOR'S WIFE

A woman believed to be a wife of a police officer based in Nhlangano escaped being killed by her husband's senior colleague on Tuesday, Boxing Day.

The identity of the woman has been withheld.

It is said *Ntombi Zulu was turned into a punching bag on Tuesday after a misunderstanding with her husband, something believed to be a daily occurrence between the lovebirds.

On Boxing Day, Zulu and her husband had an argument inside the house

at the police camp, an episode that got so out of control it became a spectacle to other police officers and their families.

Information gathered is that Zulu and her husband first had an altercation after a woman believed to be his 'makhwapheni' called and insulted her.

Infuriated

Zulu was infuriated by the calls and insults from the woman that she confronted her husband and that was when all hell broke loose.

The two argued and neighbours are said to have been drawn by what was taking place. The altercation drew the attention of many.

It is reported that a senior police offi-



cer believed to be an immediate supervisor to Zulu's husband arrived at the scene of the altercation and never bothered to ask what the problem was but instead jumped for Zulu's throat and started punching her.

The senior police officer pushed down the woman and in the process

started kicking and punching her all over the body. No one came to her rescue as also her husband watched from a distance. Zulu was dumbfounded by her husband's supervisor.

Danger

"She feels her life is in danger as it seems like her husband has ganged up with his colleagues to kill her. She has survived many attacks by her husband and at one stage; he arrived at her rented house where he destroyed almost everything.

"The relationship is now rocky as her husband is understood to be seeing another woman employed by one of the eateries in town. It's the same woman who is responsible for all this," said Zulu's close relative.

Efforts to seek help from police station's authorities in vain

*NTOMBI Zulu has allegedly been trying to get assistance from the Nhlangano Police Station without any luck.

It is said at the police station, her issue, whose husband is also a police officer, is a well-documented one as almost everyone at the station knows about their rocky relationship.

It is also said when she wants to report

an issue about him, she is no longer taken serious.

"Even when she wants to have an audience with the police station's authorities, she is denied that opportunity, as at times she is told those she wants to see are busy or are not around. There was a time where upon arrival at the police station, all those who were present started mocking her.

"In fact, she is now a laughing stock and seemingly no one entertains her each time she comes to the police station

Aware

"We are also aware that even if she can try to report what happened to her today (Tuesday), nothing is going to be done," said Zulu's relative.

Zulu is now believed to be sick and

tired of the abuse by her husband who is protected by his colleagues at the police station.

Treatment

"She needs help and the other thing is that she now considers killing herself since she feels the treatment she is subjected to by her own husband and the lack of assistance each time she reports at the police station, all is

too much for her to bear," said a friend.

Police mouthpiece Superintendent Khulani Mamba said nothing was reported to the police in relation to the issue.

"Police in Nhlangano do not know anything about this. They said they are also blank about a senior officer having assaulted a junior officer's wife," said Supt Mamba.

Wife accuses love rival of shady deals

ZULU has accused her husband's lover of generating money through illegal trade.

She accused the woman of being a drug pusher and also dagga dealer.

With Zulu's marriage to the police officer on rocky ground, it is said she is now considering exposing her husband's 'makhwapheni' as a way of revenge for destroying her marriage.

"I know why she is in relationship with him. She wants to be protected in her shady deals and uses him to cover up her illegal deals.

Assisting

"She told me over the phone how she makes money and how my husband is assisting her to go about this



illegal trade," said Zulu in an interview on Tuesday.

Zulu said since it was clear that her

husband had chosen the woman over her, she would expose her.

She said for all this time, she has been quiet and was not interested in what the woman was doing.

Dealings

"It's time I expose her, I feel it's the right time to speak on the woman's dealings.

"Her employer should now know that some of the people coming to that restaurant are not coming to buy anything but to see her over her deals.

"It's time she is arrested and I don't care even if my husband is also locked up. I am fed up and I now feel ready to have her exposed. She has done so much harm to me," said Zulu.

...Nurse also floored with vicious punch at her residence

A NURSE based at the Nhlangano Health Centre has related how Zulu's husband who is a police officer attacked her at her residence.

The nurse said Zulu was running away from the abusive husband when she (nurse) found herself on the receiving end. She said it was around August this year when Zulu came running to the nurses home with her husband hot on her heals.

"As we are close to each other, she decided to come to my house to seek refuge but he followed her. I was inside the house when I heard

the noise outside and just as I opened the door, he (police officer) inflicted a vicious blow to my face without uttering a word. He was assaulting her right in the doorway and I was drawn by her scream only to be knocked with a fist in the face," said the nurse.

The nurse said she was aware how Zulu was abused by her husband who assaults her on a daily basis.

"She is a victim of abuse and the sad part, even if she reports him, nothing is done," said the nurse.

Ngwane student fined E1 200 for drink driving

A student of Ngwane Teachers College appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso after he was nabbed driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol.

SISWATI LANGUAGE GIVING LEARNERS A HARD TIME - SISWATI BOARD

SISWATI language is giving learners a hard time in schools, it has been noted.

This was revealed by SiSwati Board Member Thembekile Msibi yesterday at The George Hotel during a press briefing. Addressing the media about the board's motives Msibi requested all the assistance the board could possibly receive in order to ensure that SiSwati language is restored.

She urged all media houses to make sure that they contribute in whatever way in ensuring that the message of restoring SiSwati language reaches the nation at large. Msibi said the need to restore SiSwati language was emphasised by the Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini earlier this year during a conference held at The George Hotel. She said the premier noted with concern the deteriorating standard of SiSwati among the youth in the country. She said after the PM spoke to the SiSwati Board, which was tasked with ensur-

ing that the SiSwati language is restored among the Swazis.

Msibi then advised that whatever the media writes or reports about, must be that which promotes the language. The Board member said they intend to see Siswati Language become a national heritage. Msibi said they want to see pupils being groomed from Pre-School level up to tertiary in SiSwati.

SPECIAL REQUEST TO MEDIA

MSIBI delivered a special request to the media saying what they have in mind as a board is to have something in SiSwati featured in all the local media platform.

She said they would be very happy if the print media could give them space of about a page where they will have something written in SiSwati and English.

Msibi said the reason they will write in SiSwati and translate in English is because through research they have discovered that learners at school are finding it hard to learn in SiSwati.

ATTENTIVE: A section of those

Msibi said the Board is already working on the competency test which the prime minister spoke about. Competency test will see people who apply to enrol in primary school or applying for admission at university or for scholarship, having to take a certain test on SiSwati. Veli Simelane from the Ministry of Information Communication and Technology under Swaziland Broadcasting and Information Services (SBIS) was also present during the meeting.

He informed the gathering that it is about time people have a clear way forward on what is the ministry of education doing to ensure that the language is restored.

He said it started with the teachers back in schools ensuring that they help learners with SiSwati.

NHLANGANO COPS RAID SHEBEENS

NHLANGANO police staged an operation dubbed 'Valatipoti' for shebeens where they were 'combing out' those operating without permits.

The operation started a couple of days ago where police arrived unannounced at Mnagwaneni and Mathendele.

Just when the police disembarked from their vehicles, it is said the shebeen owners managed to lock the beverages inside the houses and dashed away leaving only the customers. This was after the shebeen owners got a tip off that police would be conducting the raids.

"Some of us reside here (Mangwaneni) and we do not take part in some of the activities. Last Thursday, police arrived in numbers and we learned later that their mission was to round up all those found selling umcombotsi (Swazi brew) without the right documents. We saw some

of the people in this trade locking their doors and running away. They returned later after learning that the police had left," said one of the residents at Mangwaneni.

A couple of months ago, it was reported that shebeen businesses would not be allowed to operate at Mangwaneni as it is considered a royal residence where such trade should not be taking place.

The offices of Ndabazabantu and Regional Secretary, are said to have effected the ban on shebeens at Mangwaneni but things never changed as such businesses continues even to this day.

The raids by police, are said to not have any effect as immediately the police leave, the shebeen operators start all over again


"It is usually at this time of the year where shebeen business also flourishes like other businesses. The raids, yes they do hinder in a way but the owners of the shebeen seem to be clever as they wait for them (police) to leave and even before they reach the police station, it would be business as usual," said one of the resi-

Other reports are that some of the shebeens sell beers and it's then when the police would demand to liquor license as that was only reserved to be sold in bars or bottle stores.

Police mouthpiece Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed that police were conducting raids as part of the routine during festive holidays.

He said such raids were also meant to make sure that there law was not contravened.

"These are ongoing exercises where we want to clean up any illegal trade. There are shebeens which operate anyhow and as we have liquor license laws, we expect everyone to toe the line. The raids we conduct in such places, are a routine and we are still going to continue doing that. It's not just those areas in Nhlangano but we are conducting raids doing their businesses like nothing had across the country," said Supt Mamba.

Kariema says Ismah had passed matric this year after being a student at Bishop Lavis School of Skills, and had wanted to become a fashion designer.

Kariema made sure her daughter ended an abusive relationship a year ago.

"We are Muslim, but we were all together as family on Christmas Day, listening to music," she says.

"That evening after 9pm, I told Ismah I am going to sleep.

"She walked over to her ex-boyfriend's mother's home where they were celebrating the day. "Around lam, we all heard a gunshot going off and we didn't even know it was Ismah who was shot." Daily Voice

ON THE ROAD TO A UNITED SA: WHAT STILL DIVIDES US?

PRETORIA - Annually, since 1994, South Africa celebrates Reconciliation Day on 16 December. It is often around this time that we may reflect on progress made in terms of reconciliation and national unity.

The Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR), since 2003, conducts the South African Reconciliation Barometer (SARB) survey to track South Africans' sentiments pertaining to matters of reconciliation.

The 2017 SARB round shows that, at the time of surveying (June-July 2017), 75 per cent of South Africans felt that it is desirable to create a united South Africa, and 68 per cent believed it is possible to do so.

In addition, about seven in ten South Africans (74 per cent) felt that South Africa still needs reconciliation. However, only 56 per cent agreed that South Africa has made progress in reconciliation since the end of apartheid.

Ranked

What is it that (still) divides South Africans, despite a desire for unity? The SARB finds that the "gap between rich and poor" (or inequality) is ranked as the greatest source of division by South Africans, followed by "divisions between race groups", and thirdly "divisions between supporters of different political parties".

Inequality is furthermore the aspect of society that respondents to the 2017 SARB felt has made the least progress since 1994, with 77 per cent of South Africans reporting inequality has worsened or stayed the same since

In addition, 63 per cent of South Africans agreed that reconciliation is impossible for as long as people who were disadvantaged under apartheid remain poor. Inequality (and/or poverty) is thus regarded as the most divisive and enduring aspect of South



African society-hampering reconciliation processes.

The second greatest source of division relates to racial reconciliation. Almost one in every three (32 per cent) South Africans reported an improvement in race relations since 1994 – showing some progress in this regard, although muted and slow.

In order to overcome prejudices and improve relations, a first step is contact between people from various groups.

The 2017 SARB shows that South Africans have the most interaction with people from "other race groups" in commercial spaces (such as shops and malls), as well as work and study spaces. These spaces, however, are also where South Africans reported experiencing racism most frequently. Most South Africans (61 per cent) remain open to interaction with people from "other race groups" in both public and private settings, while the greatest barriers to more interaction cited by respondents (other than "none") are "language" and "confidence". More than half of South Africa's adult population approve of integration in various settings (including at schools, neighbourhoods and in terms of inter-racial marriage.

The third greatest source of division, although mainly focused on supporters of political parties, speaks to aspects of democratic political culture. The SARB posits that reconciliation is more likely to thrive in societies where a democratic political culture exists. Confidence in institutions matter in this regard, as well as political efficacy, rule of law and political community. With respect to confidence in institutions, the SARB shows a decline in confidence in key institutions over time - including in national government, Parliament and provincial government - pointing to a process of systematic erosion. Only 33 per cent of South Africans reported having "quite a lot of confidence" or "a great deal" of confidence in the incumbent political party in 2017, with lower levels of confidence in main opposition parties. One in four South Africans (26 per cent) furthermore reported not feeling close

to any political party. This is coupled with 51 per cent of South Africans agreeing that "[their] vote does not make a difference", and 56 per cent agreeing that "[v]oting is meaningless because no politician can be trusted".

While political efficacy is low, propensity for the use of violence or force for a political cause has increased from 2013-2017, showing three in ten South Africans either have or are willing to use such measures in 2017. This does not necessarily mean that South Africans do not show a regard for the rule of law, as 66 per cent of South Africans agreed that the Constitution must be upheld and adhered to at all times.

Reconciliation in South Africa's current and historical context requires a nuanced approach to overcoming and preventing social divisions. South Africans desire unity and think a united South Africa is possible.

Certain societal challenges, according to South Africans, limit progress made in this regard – briefly discussed here are those related to inequalities, racial reconciliation and aspects of democratic political culture.

Much work lies ahead – which, according to most respondents to the 2017 SABR, requires all South Africans to come to the table; as well as the involvement of a variety of institutions – including business, civil society, elected representatives and national government, faith-based organisations and individuals with their friends and families. As we near the beginning of a new year, perhaps now is also an opportune time for each of us to reflect on ways we can each be involved in helping to bridge the various divides limiting reconciliation

Should parents ask their children to apologise?

Have you ever felt deserving of an apology and been upset when you didn't get one? Have you ever found it hard to deliver the words, I'm sorry?

Such experiences show how much apologies matter. The importance placed on apologies is shared by many cultures. Diverse cultures even share a great deal in common when it comes to how apologies are communicated.

When adults feel wronged, apologies have been shown to help in a variety of ways: Apologies can reduce retaliation; they can bring about forgiveness and empathy for wrongdoers; and they can aid in the repair of broken trust. Further, sincere apologies have the physiological effect of lowering blood pressure more quickly, especially among those who are prone to hold on to anger.

How do children view and experience apologies? And what do parents think about when to prompt the



young ones to apologise?

How children understand apologies

Research shows that children as young as age four grasp the emotional implications of apology. They understand, for example, that an apology can improve the feelings of someone who's been upset. Preschoolers also judge apologising wrongdoers to be more likable, and more desirable as partners for interaction and cooperation. Children as young as

Recent studies have tested the actual impact of apologies on children. In one such study, a group of fourto seven-year-olds received an apology from a child who failed to share, while another group did not get an apology. The participants who received the apology felt better and viewed the offending child as nicer as well as more remorseful.

Another study exposed children to a more distressing event: A person knocked over a tower that six- to seven-year-olds were building. Some children got an apology, some did not. In this case, a spontaneous apology did not improve children's upset feelings.

When does a child's apology matter to parents?

Although apologies carry meaning for children, views on whether parents should ask their children to apologise vary. A recent caution against apology prompting was based on the mistaken notion that young children have limited social understanding. In fact, young children understand a great deal about others' viewpoints.

When and why parents prompt their children to apologise has not been systematically studied. In order to gain better insight into this question. I recently conducted a study with my colleagues Jee Young Noh and Michael Rizzo at the University of Maryland and Paul Harris at Harvard University.

BOOTS UNDER FIRE OVER FAILURE TO CUT COST OF THE MORNING-AFTER PILL

BOOTS has been criticised for failing to reduce the cost of the morning after pill nationwide five months after it promised it would.

The high-street pharmacy chain has lowered the price of the contraception in less than three per cent of its

It had controversially announced earlier this year that it would not follow in the footsteps of other retailers by offering the product cheaper on the grounds that it encouraged women to have unprotected sex.

Then it bowed under pressure from campaigners and vowed it would slash its generic brand of levonorgestrel from £26.75 to £15.99 from October.

But now it has revealed that the price has still only been reduced in 69 of its 2,500 outlets nationwide.

Boots has said the delay is due to low stock as a result of a batch failure' experienced by the manufactur-

'ABSOLUTELY SCANDALOUS'

The British Pregnancy Advisory Service (BPAS), which led the initial campaign asking Boots to cut the price in line with other pharmacies, tweeted on Boxing Day that it was best to 'give Boots a miss'.

It has previously said the company had acted in an 'absolutely scandalous' way by missing its own deadline for providing the pills.

2018 GDP PROJECTIONS SHOW 2.9% GROWTH

ACCORDING to gross Domestic Product (GDP) projections published by the Ministry of Economic Planning and Development in their quarter performance report, the domestic economy is estimated to have grown by 2.9 per cent in 2018.

This is an upward revision to the August projections of 1.0 per cent.

The medium term outlook (2018 - 2020) is expected to benefit from the full recovery of the agriculture sector which will also boost the agro processing sub sector. Slower growth is expected in demand driven sectors, particularly wholesale and retail and financial services, which will be negatively affected by spill over effects of the fiscal challenges," the report said.

The report projected a weaker economic growth for 2017 which was said to be decelerating to 1.0 per cent.

The weaker economic growth was due to negative effects anticipated from the ongoing fiscal challenges and weak economic activity in the South African economy.

According to the economic growth report in the Sub-Saharan Africa (SSA) region which is made up countries like Nigeria, South Africa, Swaziland is projected to pick up to 3.5 per cent in 2018, this has been largely attributed to an increase in international oil price following agreement by both Organisation of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) and non OPEC producers to trim supply, and a general improvement in com...Regulatory framework, number one challenge for businesses

THE ministry together with the Central Bank of Swaziland (Research Department) visits companies annually between January and April with the purpose of collecting data on economic developments in order to inform planning, development and implementation of appropriate policy measures.

"A number of challenges were cited by companies as major hindrance to doing business in the country amongst which is regulatory framework was cited as number one challenge by most business entities," the report said



COTTON PRODUCTION RISES TO 614 TONS

THE Swaziland Cotton Board has reportedly increased production to 614 metric tons when compared to 87 metric tons in 2016.

This is according to the Ministry of Agricultures second quarter performance report for 2017/2018 financial year.

"The overall production increased to 614 metric tons compared to 817 metric tons in 2016, the number of farmers engaged in cotton increased to 1 110 compared to 231 in 2015/16.

Area planted also increased to 1 200 hectares (ha) compared to 238 ha as a result of the Board's decision to issuing free planting seeds at the beginning of the season," the report said.

According to the report the projections for the 2017/18 season is 1 500



ha, 10 tonnes of Alba QM 301 has been ordered from Quton Seed Company in Zimbabwe. The board is said to engage 1500 farmers this season with a potential yield of 800 metric tonnes. A training plan for cotton management and strengthening farmers associations has been finalised. In addition the report further revealed that a total of 186 642 kg of seed cotton was purchased during the quarter, the crop is valued at E1 060 782.65.

This accounts for 30 per cent of the total purchase for the season.

"Transport costs to the ginnery were borne by the Board and stood at E70 404.88 contractors were paid E55 630 with the balance paid to growers who delivered their crops using their own transport.

Levy collected during the quarter stood at E20 530.51 the highest intake was 130 257 tons which was received in July followed by 40 003 tons," the report said.

The report further revealed that quality profile for the crop indicated a drop from 89.30 per cent to 79.78 per cent of the A grade and an increase from 9.82 to 15.48 per cent of the B grade and the rest was shared between other grades. The decline in quality, is attributed to rats and the weather conditions prevailed during the picking period.

Apple CEO Cook pockets \$102m after 74% bonus hike

WASHINGTON - Apple Chief Executive Officer Tim Cook received a 74 per cent increase in his annual bonus for fiscal 2017 as the iPhone maker posted higher revenue and net income, after a rare decline a year earlier.

Cook's incentive pay totalled \$9.33m for the year ended September 30, the Cupertino, California-based company said on Wednesday in a regulatory filing. He also took home \$3.06m in salary and a previously disclosed equity award of \$89.2m, bringing his total pay out for the year to about \$102m.

His top five lieutenants each got bonuses of \$3.11m, bringing their total compensation to about \$24.2m each, including salaries and stock awards.

The equity compensation is composed of shares that vest solely based on the executives' continued employment and others tied to the performance of Apple's stock compared with other S&P 500 companies.

Apple has increased the proportion of performance shares in its equity awards, which boosts potential future earnings for the executives if the company outperforms its S&P 500 peers. History suggests that could be a

good deal for them.
In 2014, executives including Dan Riccio, chief of hardware engineering, and former General Counsel Bruce Sewell received performance awards that paid out three years later at almost twice as many target shares as planned after Apple's stock returned 69 per cent over that span, including reinvested dividends. *Bloomberg*

Another blow for Steinhoff as Moody's again wields downgrade axe

CAPE TOWN - Ratings agency Moody's yesterday again downgraded the ratings of embattled global furniture retailer Steinhoff.

Moody's downgraded Steinhoff International Holdings NV [JSE:SNH] and Steinhoff Investment Holdings.

The ratings agency has assigned a Caal Corporate Family Rating to the two companies, and a B3.za national scale Corporate Family Rating to Steinhoff Investment Holdings.


Caal is the seventh rung of non-investment grade, which indicates high credit risk.

Corporate family ratings, according to Moody's, are an "opinion of a corporate family's ability to honour all of its financial obligations and is assigned to a corporate family as if it had a single class of debt and a single consolidated legal entity structure".

Steinhoff, which is registered in Amsterdam, owns about 40 different brands in some 30 countries

At the same time, Moody's said it has downgraded the backed senior unsecured notes rating of Steinhoff Europe AG to Caal from B1.

It has also assigned a Caa1-PD probability of default ratings (PDR) to Steinhoff and Steinhoff Investment Holdings.



The ratings agency added that, in line with its practice for corporates with non-investment grade ratings, it withdrew the B1 issuer rating it had previously assigned to Steinhoff and the B1/Baa3.za issuer ratings assigned to Steinhoff Investment Holdings.

All these ratings remain under review for further downgrade.

Yesterday's ratings action was the second time

this month that Moody's downgraded the global furniture and household goods retailer. On December 7, a day after its share price commenced a steep fall, Moody's lowered its credit rating four notches from Baa3 - the last rung of investment grade - to B1, the fourth level of non-investment grade.

Moody's said its latest rating decisions recognise the financial flexibility offered by Steinhoff's listed investments and its "predominantly unencumbered European property portfolio spanning retail, warehousing and manufacturing".

However, in its view Steinhoff may not be able to monetise these assets in a timely manner under current circumstances.

Steinhoff's share price has dropped over 90 per cent this month, after its CEO Markus Jooste abruptly resigned and it announced that PwC was investigating "accounting irregularities requiring further investigation" in its books.

The Stellenbosch-headquartered group's 2017 audited results are on hold, and it has warned investors not to rely on the figures contained in its 2016 results.

At the time of the announcement at 11:50, Steinhoff shares traded 0.87 per cent firmer at R4.66 on the JSE. *FIN24*

MTN SHARES LOWER AS PROFIT FORECAST FROM IHS DEAL LOWERED

JOHANNESBURG - MTN's share price fell two per cent to R133 yesterday morning after it warned that a R6bn profit from a deal with cellphone tower operator IHS would be cut by R2.8bn.

MTN said the R6bn profit it had booked in its interim results from the deal had been reduced to R3.2bn by a R2.8bn loan agreement in the second half of its financial year.

In February, MTN exchanged cellphone towers it owned in Nigeria in a partnership with IHS, called Interco, for a 29 per cent stake in an enlarged IHS. This deal included a \$231m (about R2.8bn) shareholder loan which MTN said had now been assigned to IHS.

"The combination of the profit from the exchange of Interco shares for IHS shares in the first half of the 2017 financial year and the loss on assignment of the shareholder loan in the second half of the year has a combined positive impact of R3.2bn to earnings in 2017," yesterday's statement said.

MTN's financial year ends in December and it releases its results in early March.

As part of the deal, IHS "has facilitated certain network volume commitments and provided more attractive terms for MTN Nigeria's future network roll-out applicable from 2018 onwards", the statement said.

Consumers warned of rough economic road ahead

CAPE TOWN - Consumers are in for a rough ride in 2018 and are warned to tighten their belts even further.

Neil Roets, Chief Executive of Debt Rescue, said many South Africans who barely made ends meet during the year have plunged themselves ever deeper into debt over the holiday season.

"With major price increases for food and other essential commodities on the cards as well as a continued sluggish growth rate predicted for the new year, South Africans are in for a rough ride in 2018. Unemployment is now at 27.7 per cent, and key jobs sectors, including mining and the industrial sector, are expected to continue shedding jobs at unprecedented rates," he said. However, Roets said that the election of Cyril Ramaphosa as ANC President holds prospects for greater political and economic stability. "There is a likelihood he may become the next president; there is a greater possibility of at least some foreign direct investment coming into the country next year," he said.

South African Reserve Bank Governor Lesetja Kganyago recently made the point that although the country's unemployment rate was already among the highest in the world at 25 per cent (currently at 27.7 per cent), it was expected to deteriorate further in 2018.

The only other comparable countries to have such high rates, according to data by the International Monetary Fund, are Spain and Greece, Roets said. "It seems sad that we have to be so pessimistic at such a happy time of the year but the sooner consumers realise the economy is in trouble and tighten their belts, the fewer of them will have to come to us to bail them out by placing them under debt review," Roets said. 'No decision made yet on cash-strapped Denel'

JOHANNESBURG - The defence department said yesterday the government had not yet made a decision on how to handle state-owned arms manufacturer Denel's financial woes.

The department said in a statement it was concerned about a newspaper report speculating that the government might consider selling a stake in Denel. "Such speculations should not create an impres-

sion that government is leaning towards a specific direction with regard to the challenges facing Denel," it said. Wrong

"This may send (the) wrong message to the industry as well as the financial markets during sensitive negotiations on Denel's financial situation."

In the event that a consideration or decision to sell stake in Denel was made, the gov-

ernment "will have to carefully determine which parts of the Denel SoC should be sold, through which model and to whom," the department said.

Earlier this month, Denel moved to assure its employees they would receive their December salaries as well as their outstanding 13th cheques despite a severe liquidity cri-

Mining houses could do well despite strong rand

JOHANNESBURG - The rand was at R12.26 to the Dollar at 7am yesterday morning, its strongest level since June 2015.

The Rand strengthened three per cent on Wednesday from R12.63 to the Dollar as the market resumed trading after the Christmas break and reacted to reports in Sunday newspapers that the ANC's new leadership was negotiating President Jacob Zuma's exit.

The Rand was at R14.62 to the Euro and R16.47 to the

Pound. The Rand's rally hammered the JSE's foreign bluechip index tracking exchangetraded funds on Wednesday.

CoreShares S&P 500 tracker fell 2.41 per cent to R33.55 despite the index remaining flat at 2,683 points. Sygnia's Euro Stoxx 50 tracker fell three per cent to R52.98 and its FTSE 100 tracker fell 3.1 per cent to R126.01.

Rising commodity prices may make yesterday a good day for the JSE's miners despite the rising rand. In Sydney, BHP was up 0.5 per cent to A\$29.50 thanks to Brent crude oil remaining above \$66 a barrel and copper reaching a four-year high of \$7 240 a tonne on the London Metals Exchange (LME).

On the JSE on Wednesday, the strengthening rand led BHP to fall one per cent to R247.68 and Anglo American to lose 0.3 per cent to R256.04.

The stronger rand outweighed rising oil prices for Sasol, causing it to fall 0.2 per cent to R418.05. BHP's rise in Sydney on Thursday morning helped the Australian Securities Exchange's S&P/ASX 200 index gain 0.2 per cent.

#SAA denies procuring bottled water, fuel at premium

JOHANNESBURG - Cash-strapped national carrier South African Airways yesterday rejected as false reports that it was paying more for its bottled water and fuel than the market price.

"We took note of comments on social media platforms suggesting that we procure at premium commodities such as bottled water and fuel. Nothing could be further from the truth," SAA said in a statement.

It said it bought bottled water at a rate less than the wholesale price (R2.75) suggested on social media platforms and was also comfortable it was buying fuel, which accounts for about 25 per cent of its operating costs, "within a competitive price range".

Last month, SAA's chief financial officer told Parliament the airline's losses for the current year were expected to reach R4 billion, exceeding a forecast of R2.8 billion, due to the retirement of five aircraft which had forced it to cancel flights.

New Chief Executive Vuyani Jarana told Parliament's standing committee on finance that SAA would have to find R4 billion to pay back foreign and local lenders by the end of March in 2018. African News Agency/ANA



DOZENS DEAD IN SUICIDE BOMBING IN AFGHAN CAP

KABUL - Around 40 people were killed and dozens more wounded when a suicide bomber blew himself up inside a Shiite cultural centre in Kabul yesterday, officials said, in the latest violence to hit the

There was no immediate claim of responsibility but the Taliban was quick to deny involvement in the assault near the Afghan Voice Agency, a media outlet which earlier reports had suggested could have been the target.

Deputy Interior Ministry spokesman Nasrat Rahimi told AFP the attack was in fact aimed at the Shiite Tabayan cultural centre in the west of the city.

"The suicide attacker detonated himself during a gathering at Tabayan cultural centre causing a lot of casualties," Rahimi said.

The main explosion was followed by two smaller bomb blasts that did not cause casualties, he said, adding that the gathering was being held to

mark the 38th anniversary of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan.

There were chaotic scenes at the Istiqlal Hospital where ambulances brought victims, including women and children. Many of them were suf-

fering severe burns to their

faces and bodies, as well as shrapnel wounds, AFP reporters said.

Anguished relatives searching for their loved ones inside the medical facility, slapping their heads in fury as they cried and cursed the government for seemingly being unable to end the regular carnage on their streets. Some were so distraught they crawled on the ground pulling their hair.

An AFP reporter saw badly burned bodies lying on the floor in a room inside the hospital and wooden coffins being delivered so families could take away their dead loved ones.

Kabul has become one of the deadliest places in war-torn Afghanistan for civilians in recent months, as the Taliban step up their attacks and the Islamic State group (IS) seeks to expand its presence in the country.

Yesterday's assault comes days after a suicide bomber killed six civilians in an attack near an Afghan intelligence agency compound in the city, which was claimed by IS.

The Middle Eastern jihadist group has gained ground in Afghanistan since it first appeared in the region in 2015 and has scaled up its attacks in Kabul, including on security installations and the country's Shiite minority. AFP

Islamic State suspects detained

ISTANBUL - Turkish police detained 38 people. some of them Syrian citizens, over suspected links to Islamic State in an operation yesterday in the north-western province of Bursa, the staterun Anadolu news agency said.Counter-terrorism police carried out simultaneous raids on homes in various districts of Bursa, smashing doors open with battering rams and searching the properties, it said.Islamic State militants have carried out gun and bomb attacks in Turkey. Lawyer convicted in fraud trial

NEW YORK - A former lawyer for "Pharma Bro" Martin Shkreli has been found guilty of helping the disgraced executive and hedge fund manager commit fraud. Evan Greebel was convicted Wednesday of conspiracy to commit securities fraud and conspiracy to commit wire fraud following an 11- week trial in New York, the US Department of Justice said in a statement. He faces up to 20 years in prison at his sentencing hearing which will take place at a later date.

Obama the most admired man

WASHINGTON - Former US president Barack

Obama is the most admired man in the United States and former secretary of state Hillary Clinton the most admired woman, according to a poll published. Obama came out on top of the annual Gallup survey for the 10th year in a row while Clinton, who lost last year's presidential election to Donald Trump, was named the



most admired woman for the 16th straight year. Seventeen per cent of the Americans polled said Obama was the man they admired most, down from 22 per cent last year.

200 000 passports recalled

TAIWAN - An airport mix-up leading to a misprint on Taiwan's passport has resulted in the country recalling passports that mistakenly feature an image of Washington-Dulles Airport instead of its very own Taoyuan International Airport. According to Travel and Leisure, the error on the passport - which began distribution last week - was pointed out on local social media network Weibo on December 25. On Tuesday, December 26, Taiwan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) "acknowledged the mistake and recalled the 285 passports that had already been issued to Taiwanese citizens". A total of 200 000 copies of the passport book had already been printed - all of which the Taiwanese government will destroy. TRAVELLER24

Oil sales broken to North Korea

BEIJING - China said yesterday there had been no UN sanction-breaking oil sales by Chinese ships to North Korea, after a South Korea newspaner said Chinese and North Korean vessels had been illicitly linking up at sea to get oil to North Korea. The UN Security Council last week unanimously imposed new sanctions on North Korea for a recent intercontinental ballistic missile test, seeking to limit its access to refined petroleum products and crude oil. The UN resolution seeks to ban nearly 90 per cent of refined petroleum exports to North Korea by capping them at 500 000 barrels a year. The US - drafted resolution also caps crude oil supplies to North Korea at 4 million barrels a year and commits the Council to further reductions if it were to conduct another nuclear test or launch another ICBM.

PM ready for Catalan separatists despite election disaster

MADRID - Despite taking fire for losing a snap election in Catalonia, Prime Minister Mariano Rajoy faces the new year better equipped to block a separatist drive in the wealthy region, analysts said.

His detractors have called the results of the December 21 election, which saw separatist parties hold on to their majority in the Catalan Parliament, a "fiasco" and a "rout" for Rajoy, in power

Pro - independence parties failed to win a majority of ballots cast but neither did parties in favour of Spanish unity do as well as was hoped for by the majority of Spain's political class.

Rajoy's conservative Popular Party (PP) saw its marginal representation in the 135-seat Catalan Parliament reduced even further, to just four seats, from 11 previously.

Its main rival, the relative newcomer Ciudadanos, won the most seats with 36, mainly by luring away traditional PP supporters.

At first glance Rajoy appeared to have lost his bet by calling the snap polls after he invoked constitution article 155, allowing him to suspend Catalonia's autonomy and impose direct rule in response to the separatists' independence drive.

But political consultant Ignacio Varela said, "article 155 played its role which was not to win the elections or improve the PP's results, or make separatism disappear, but rather to stifle a rebellion against the constitution."

Catalonia's three separatist parties had approved laws in September to "disconnect" the region from Spain, organised a banned independence referendum on October 1 and then proclaimed independence on October 27.

After Rajoy intervened, experts said the separatists recognised that they had underestimated the capacity of the Spanish state to react.

Barack Obama warns about dangers of social media but...

LONDON - Former President Barack Obama told Prince Harry in an interview broadcast on Wednesday that people in leadership roles must be careful in their use of social media and warned against spending too much time immersed in the internet at the expense of the world out-

Obama did not, however, directly mention his successor, President Donald Trump, who has made the use of Twitter a centerpiece of his presidency.

"All of us in leadership have to find ways to recreate a common space on the internet," he said. "One of the dangers of the internet is people can have entirely different realities. They can be

just cocooned in information that reinforces their current biases." He spoke with Harry in the prince's capacity as guest editor of the BBC Radio 4 news programme. Both men said the interview, recorded in Canada in September, was Obama's first since leaving the presidency in January.

Obama said he felt serene the

day he left the White House at the end of his second four-year term despite the vast amount of work that remained unfinished. He said it was "hugely liberating" to be able to set his own agenda in the morning to have the time to talk with his wife, Michelle, now that he is no longer president.

Israel passes controversial law curbing police powers

JERUSALEM - Israel's Parliament passed a controversial law yesterday limiting the police's ability to recommend charges following their investigations after criticism that lawmakers were seeking to protect Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. The law will not apply to current investigations, however, meaning that graft probes involving Netanyahu will not be affected - a change made after widespread criticism and large protests against corruption.

Members of Parliament gave final approval to the bill by a vote of 59-54 early yesterday after a marathon debate lasting nearly two days.

Under the law, police will no longer be able to recommend to the attorney general whether or not to charge suspects at the con-

clusion of an investigation. The new law requires the attorney general to ask for police input. Netanyahu called for changes to the legislation in early December after his opponents said it was designed to help him survive ongoing corruption investiga-

The premier said it should be made clear that it "will not involve current investigations against me". His call came after thousands of people protested against corruption. AFP

Mboro expected in court in January

JOHANNESBURG - Controversial pastor, Paseka 'Mboro' Motsoeneng, is expected to appear in court in January on a charge of common assault.

He appeared in the Palm Ridge Magistrate's Court yesterday after he was arrested for allegedly attacking a female paramedic with Ekurhuleni Emergency Services (EMS).

The paramedic alleges she was assaulted at Mboro's Incredible Happenings Ministry on Sunday when emergency services were called out to attend to a sick child.

The pastor blamed inaction by paramedics for the three-year-old girl's death at his church.

But paramedics said the pastor and some of the congregants attacked them. The female emergency services worker was allegedly slapped by the pastor. EMS said she needed a surgical procedure for a wound on her right cheek. At the same time. The mother of the three-year-old laid charges of culpable homicide against the paramedics who responded to the scene. Court officials said investigations are still underway and they want to put the two cases on the same docket. *eNCA*

The gourd bubbles - Zuma explains Zulu saying he used at ANC conference

DURBAN – President Jacob Zuma on Wednesday explained the Zulu saying "Iyabhubhudla inkezo", which he used at the recent ANC elective conference, just before the announcement of his successor as ANC president.

Zuma was singing his famous Umshini Wami song on December 18 when officials from EleXions Agency arrived to announce his successor after more than 4 000 delegates had voted.

When he saw the officials, he stopped singing and loudly and excitedly said: "Sebefikile [They have arrived]. Iyabhubhudla inkezo [The gourd bubbles]".

Speaking at the 16th Jacob Zuma RDP Education Trust Senior Citizen's Christmas Party in his hometown in Nkandla on Wednesday, Zuma said that by using the saying he simply meant that a good time was being had at the conference.

He said the saying was used to invite a passer-by in when there's beer and festivities at one's home.

"During the ANC conference in the past few days I said, 'Iyabhubhudla inkezo'. Many people have been asking what I meant. When we're in a festive mood back at our homes in the rural areas, inkezo (gourd) is used to fetch beer from a traditional Zulu pot (ukhamba)," he said.

Zuma said when the gourd is lowered into the beer pot, it creates bubbles which suggest that there's still plenty of beer in the pot.

"When someone passes by while I'm stretching outside my house. I don't tell him to 'come here we're drinking', but I say, 'Iyabhubhudla inkezo'. In other words telling him we're having a good time here, we're drinking," he explained.

"What I meant was that we were having a good time at the conference," he said.

President Zuma hosts the 16th annual Jacob Zuma RDP Education Trust Senior Citizens Christmas Party, KwaNxamalala, Nkandla,

Zuma's preferred candidate Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma was up against the country's Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa.

Ramaphosa won with 2 440 votes compared to Dlamini-Zuma's 2 261 votes.

"Don't take it the other way, because I see some people would try to explain it in another way," he said.

The former ANC president did not explain how the saying could be taken "the other way".

Zuma, who also gave the elderly Christmas gifts, said respecting senior citizens was a "beautiful" thing.

"If you don't respect elders, angels and ancestors will turn their backs on you. Old people are very important," he said.

Zuma said the events such as Wednesday's were important to the government.

"This kind of Christmas gives government a chance to be close to elderly people. I wish the grandfathers and mothers a merry Christmas and a prosperous new year," he said.

POLICE RESCUE TEEN FORCED INTO MARRIAGE

CAPE TOWN - Eastern Cape police have rescued a 14-year-old girl being forced into a marriage allegedly arranged by her mother and uncles. The practice is known as *ukuthwala*.

The girl, who cannot be named because she is underage, was allegedly being forced into a union with a 26-year-old mineworker from KuMvezo near Qunu in the Eastern Cape. The family is alleged to have received seven cattle for *lobola*.

She was rescued on Christmas

It is understood that her family

and that of the man's had arranged the marriage without her knowledge. She was sent to live with the man.

Petros Majola, Director of the non-profit Khula Development Project that supports children, said the girl was in a place of safety.

"I am shocked that people continue with *ukathwala*, forcing mostly young girls into these arranged marriages. We call on the justice department to give harsher sentences to those who are found to have been involved in these crimes," said Majola.

Wife arrested for murder of acclaimed artist Walter Meyer

JOHANNESBURG - The wife of acclaimed South African landscape artist Walter Meyer has been arrested in connection with his murder in Upington, Northern Cape police said yesterday.

"She is 28 years old and appeared in court yesterday [Wednesday]," said Captain Jack September.

The 52-year-old artist was found dead at his home in Augrabies Park last Friday night.

It is claimed that Meyer had been involved in a quarrel with his wife at 21:55.

She then allegedly "stabbed him in the chest".

"He died on the scene. She was arrested," said September.

The wife is expected to apply for bail at the Upington Magistrate's Court today.

Meyer was an award winning artist, who had received international attention.

In 2012, Graham's Fine Art Gallery described his work as encapsulating landscapes "from the arid and unforgiving terrain of the Namib Desert, the Karoo and the Kalahari through the small towns and dilapidated farmhouses dotted across

the South African terrain to the rich vegetation around Camps Bay and the sparkling blue waters of the Atlantic Ocean".

US MARINES' BIZARRE TOPLESS LS IN SUB-ZERO COND

PYEONGCHANG - South Korean and US Marines took part in joint training exercises in sub-zero conditions ahead of the Winter Olympics in Pyeongchang

Around 220 marines and another 220 South Korean troops took part in a number of military exercises - including topless hand-to-hand combat - at the site of the games in Pyeongchang in South

It is feared that Kim Jong-un may launch an attack during the games next February with the UN General Assembly approving a resolution last month calling for all countries to observe a truce.

But the military exercises, that have been carried out since 2013, are said to risk infuriating leaders in Pyongyang and were under consideration to be scrapped to avoid raising tensions.

The three-week programme began on December 4 and have seen the seminaked troops performing star jumps, press-ups and carrying out other physical tests with the emphasis often on team bonding.

The marines wore camouflaged face paint as they competed in a number of military exercises and games

The exercises also emphasise the close relationship between South Korea and the US at a time of high tension on the Korean Peninsula.

South Korean Marine Corps Commandant Lt. General Jun Jin-goo told the marines: "You are a symbol of the robust South Korea-US alliance, overcoming the severe cold with com-

"Let's defend the Republic of Korea (South Korea) firmly on the basis of hot comradeship and strong combat power of the allies' Marine Corps.

Zimbabwe ex-army chief Chiwenga sworn in as VP

HARARE - Zimbabwe's former army commander who led a military takeover that helped end Robert Mugabe's 37-year rule was yesterday sworn in as one of the country's two vice presidents.

General Constantino Chiwenga, 61, took the oath of office in Harare, pledging to be "faithful" to Zimbabwe and to "obey, uphold and defend the Constitution", said an AFP journalist who witnessed the ceremony.

"I will discharge my duties with all my strength and to the best of my knowledge and ability," said Chiwenga dressed in a black suit.



Chiwenga retired from the military last week, slightly over a month after

the military temporarily took control of the country on November 15, cul-

minating in Mugabe's resignation six days later. Emmerson Mnangagwa, who had a few weeks earlier been sacked from his job as vice president by Mugabe, then took over as the head of state.

Kembo Mohadi, a veteran politician and long-serving state security minister, was also sworn-in Thursday as the second vice president to Mnangagwa. Mugabe, 93, was ousted from power after the military stepped in following internal feuding and factionalism that had escalated in the ruling Zanu-PF party over who would succeed him. *News*

Egyptian president's backers say 12m want him to run again

CAIRO-Supporters of Egypt's president announced on Sunday that they have collected more than 12 million signatures from people urging him to run for a second four-year term, a mostly symbolic gesture as there is little doubt he will contest, and win, next year's elections.

A General-turned-president, Abdel-Fattah al-Sisi has yet to formally announce his candidacy. He has said he will make his decision after gauging popular reaction to a "factsheet" of his achievements due to be publicised next month. Sisi was elected in 2014, a year after leading the military's overthrow of an elected but divisive Islamist president, Mohammed Morsi of the now-outlawed Muslim

Brotherhood. The government has since waged a heavy crack-

down on dissent, jailing thousands of people — mostly Islamists but also many secular pro-democracy activists. It has also blocked hundreds of websites, banned all unauthorised demonstrations and slapped a travel ban on many rights campaigners.

With his win in the 2018 vote an almost foregone conclusion, a large voter turnout would take on added significance, affirming el-Sissi's candidacy as the people's choice. His likely opponents — the list so far includes a prominent rights activist, a former prime minister and an opposition politician thrown out of Parliament — are not expected to pose a serious challenge to him securing a second term. ZIMBABWEAN FAMILY STUCK IN BANGKOK FOR TWO MONTHS

BANGKOK – A Zimbabwean family has been marooned at Bangkok's main airport for two months, an ordeal over the holiday season that has drawn widespread sympathy among Thais.

Thai immigration police said yesterday that the family, four adults and four children — who are aged between two and 11 years old — have tried to leave Thailand since late October.

But they lack visas for onward travel, refuse to return to Zimbabwe and are denied re-entry to the

by Tom Hanks finds himself stuck in a New York airport after his government collapses, rendering his papers useless. Immigration police said the family entered Thailand in May on tourist visas.

On October 23 they tried to fly to Spain via Ukraine, but were denied by the airline as they lacked Spanish visas. As they had overstayed their Thai visas by several months they were banned from re-entering the country.

We Stand By Our Vote - Govt

TANZANIA - Government and political analysts have said that, as a sovereign country, Tanzania cannot be swayed by foreign aid in its decisions on both local and international affairs.

The remarks were made, almost unanimously, in response to US threats of aid cutbacks on account of government support of a UN resolution recognising Tel Aviv, instead of Jerusalem, as capital of Israel.

Speaking to the Daily News over the phone yesterday, the Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs and East African Cooperation, Ms Suzan Kolimba said that, as a sovereign country, Tanzania could not also interfere in the internal affairs of any other country.

"We are a sovereign country ... our principles on foreign policy decisions are well known internationally.

We respect the fundamental human rights enshrined in our laws and international (all) conventions to which we are signatory ... we never (seek to) undermine anybody," she explained. She also underlined that Tanzania would "always strictly observe principles, laws, rules and regulations"

On possible aid cuts by the US government on account of the vote on the UN resolution, Ms Kolimba said Tanzania could not interfere in any other country's decisions.

"To give or not to give aid is purely an internal affair ... and that is decided by the respective country ... it's illogical that any one person should be telling another person what to do or what not to in this context," she noted.

However, the deputy minister asked media to dwell on issues that were beneficial to the public, instead of 'wasting' much time on matters that, in many ways, could harm the nation.

A veteran politician, Mr Pius Msekwa, said Tanzania could not, possibly, be swayed by foreign aid in making decisions on both local and international affairs.





LONDON – The acclaim for the goal-scoring feats of Tottenham Hotspur's Harry Kane has been the deafening soundtrack to the festive football programme as even Arsene Wenger, Manager of the club that let him out of their grasp, joined in on Wednesday.

Arsenal boss Wenger once admitted to being "a bit angry" when he learned how his club had let a nine-year-old Kane leave after a year in the Gunners' junior ranks only for the boy to become a phenomenon for their nearest and biggest rivals.

Yet, after Kane became Europe's premier marksman of the year on Tuesday with his 56th goal of 2017 in Spurs' 5-2 thrashing of Southampton, even Wenger was in the mood to salute the one that got away up to the other end of London's Seven Sisters Road.

"He has done it and would I have predicted it? I would modestly say no," Wenger admitted, when asked about Kane's remarkable feat on Wednesday.

"What he has done is beat people like (Lionel) Messi and (Cristiano) Ronaldo, who are unbeatable in my head, so what he has done is absolutely fantastic."

Whereas Messi, who has scored 54 for Barcelona and Argentina, and Ronaldo (53 for Real Madrid

and Portugal), made their hay in La Liga, the England striker's achievement was even more special because it was set in a more competitive Premier League, reckoned Wenger.

"Yes, that is why I say that what he has achieved is absolutely amazing," said Wenger, echoing the plaudits that suggest the blossoming of the 24-year-old is a reason for English football to be particularly cheerful going into a World Cup year.

Alan Shearer, whose calendar year record of 36 Premier League goals that Kane broke against Southampton en route to taking his tally with a hat-trick to 39, warned that Kane's heroics would

only heighten the interest of giants like Real Madrid and Barcelona.

"It's inevitable they will come calling or come asking, because he's that good a player and wouldn't look out of place in either of those teams," Shearer, the Premier League's record scorer, told the BBC, he felt it was not a given that Kane would leave Spurs, though, unless they failed to win any silverware.

"That could be a huge call if Tottenham in two or three years haven't won a trophy and his form is still as good as it is," said Shearer. "Then he'll have a big question to answer, because I'm sure the big boys will come calling." Reuters

Pep's secret recipe working out for City

MANCHESTER - Pep Guardiola has warned Manchester City's Premier League rivals that his team will find a way to win in every match.

Guardiola's side stretched their lead at the top of the Premier League to 15-points over Manchester United on Wednesday with a 1-0 victory at Newcastle United.

Rafael Benitez's men attempted to stop City with an ultra-defensive approach, but Raheem Sterling's first-half goal proved to be enough despite some late pressure from the hosts.

Speaking after the game Guardiola talked about how he had to set up his team to win in the face of his opponent's defensive approach.

"As a manager, I have to adapt my team to convince them. In these 18 games, we have played against teams who have done high pressing, low pressing, counter-attacks, just set pieces, just like Tottenham who tried to go forward and attack, and in all of them, we have been able to beat them "said Guardiola"

able to beat them," said Guardiola.

"The magnificent thing about football and any manager of any team is they can play any way. "Teams can try to trick you, but you have to be able to beat them and until now we have been able to do that. Until now, we have found a way to win." The win could have been more comfortable as City hit the woodwork twice through Sergio Aguero and Magpies keeper Rob Elliot made several important saves.

"Of course, this was tough - it's the Premier League and everyone says this is the toughest one. But if you analyse 90 minutes, we were much, much better and created enough chances in the first-half and the start of the second half," added Guardiola. Sport24



A date and venue for the mega-fight have yet to be agreed, with Hearn revealing last week that March 24, March 31 and April 7 are currently being considered alongside a number of stadiums including Twickenham and Cardiff's Principality Stadium.

But Parker's promoter David Higgins told Sportsmail yesterday that the fight is a 'giant leap forward', with the

WBO champion hoping to come to London as early as the middle of next month to begin the promotional tour.

New Zealander's team had originally hoped to secure a 40 cent per stake in the fight, before dropping their demands to 35.

Now, Higgins claims the two camps have each made small concessions that mean both sides are happy and that we're a whole lot closer.'

'I'd like to pay tribute to Anthony Joshua and Eddie Hearn, Higgins said. 'They've both said they want to unify. Talk is cheap but by stepping up on this occasion they're proving that they do actually want to unify as does our side and Joseph Parker.

Joshua, the WBA and IBF champion, would be the heavy favourite for the unification bout. But the WBO king's team have accused AJ in recent months of having a 'glass jaw', even holding a press conference to highlight the British fighter's perceived frailties.

'Most of the blinded British fans think Joshua is this unbeatable messiah with no chinks in his armour when, in fact, there are many. By the time I've finished my job they're going to think Parker's the favourite,' Higgins claimed yesterday. Daily Mail

Nadal pulls out of Brisbane, but says yes to Oz Open

BRISBANE - World No 1 Rafael Nadal has withdrawn from the Brisbane International with a knee injury, but said he still intends to play in next month's Australian Open.

The Spaniard, who hasn't played since losing to David Goffin at the World Tour Finals in London, was scheduled to start his season in Brisbane this weekend, but said he would now not be coming.

"I am sorry to announce I won't be coming to Brisbane this year," Nadal said on Twitter yesterday.

"My intention was to play but I am still not ready after last year's long season and the late start of my preparation." But Nadal said he still planned to play in the year's opening Grand Slam tournament, starting in Melbourne on January 15. "I will be seeing my Aussie

fans when I land on the 4th (of January) in Melbourne and start there my preparation for the Australian Open," he added.

Reports casting doubt over Nadal's recovery from an injury to his right knee surfaced last week when he pulled out of an exhibition in Abu Dhabi this week and took at least four days off from practice.

Nadal, 31, has had a stellar 2017, claiming a 10th French Open, a third US Open crown and the yearending world number one spot.

Nadal added two Masters titles at Monte Carlo and Madrid to his triumphs at Roland Garros and Flushing Meadows, finishing the campaign with six trophies. The 16-time Grand Slam champion also secured the year-ending top ranking for a fourth time.

MILAN'S PATRICK CUTRONE DUMPS INTER OUT OF CUP

MILAN - Milan teenager Patrick Cutrone scored a sensational extratime goal to dump Inter Milan out of the Italian Cup on Wednesday and book a semifinal showdown with Lazio.

The 19-year-old broke through after 109 minutes under driving rain at the San Siro after the match had ended 0-0 in regular time to set up a two-legged semifinal against the Romans who saw off Fiorentina 1-0 on Tuesday.

The victory was a welcome relief for new Milan coach Gennaro Gattuso who had likened the clash to "a World Cup final". "To think that yesterday I was in Primavera (Milan's youth team), now cheering at San Siro with this magnificent crowd is something incredible," said Cutrone who was booked for taking his jersey off in the celebrations after scoring.

"I think this victory was necessary for morale, the derby can't be described as a normal game, but now we're enjoying this victory and this shift and from tomorrow we will think about the challenge against Fiorentina."

Milan went into the game in 11th place in Serie A, a massive 21 points behind league leaders Napoli, meaning the Italian Cup and the Europa League, where they have made the last

32, are their only avenues to silverware this season.

But it was a third consecutive defeat for Inter who are third in Serie A, five points off the leaders.

Luciano Spalletti's Inter have lost steam following their strong start to the season, already needing penalties to get past third division Pordenone in the last round. Goalkeeper Antonio Donnarumma made his senior debut for Milan as younger brother Gianluigi Donnarumma and Marco Storari were both injured.

And the 27-year-old – who joined Milan last summer as part of the negotiations for the renewal of his brother's contract – had a baptism of fire with the video assistant referee (VAR) coming to his rescue in the first half as he awkwardly turned the ball into his own net. *AFP*

Inter set tough Lazio test after Cup flop

MILAN - Inter Milan turn their focus back to their flagging Serie A campaign after their Italian Cup derby flop hosting Lazio tomorrow looking to keep pace with leading duo Napoli and Juventus who are jostling to end 2017 on top.

Luciano Spalletti's side – third in Serie A five points behind leaders Napoli – have now suffered three consecutive losses and face a tough task against fifth-placed Lazio to keep their Scudetto ambitions on track.

A defeat to the Romans would see Inter drop further behind the leaders as Napoli look set to end 2017 top of the Italian football league table for the second time in three years at third-from-bottom Crotone today.

Napoli have 45 points from 18 games ahead of their trip further south to Calabria, just one ahead of Juventus, who saw off titlerivals AS Roma 1-0 last weekend, and travel to second-frombottom Verona tomorrow.

Inter are third two points ahead of Roma with Lazio a further two points back in fifth with the two teams from the capital both having a game in hand.

Spalletti was scathing of his players, including leading Serie A scorer Mauro Icardi and winger Ivan Perisic after a 1-0 extra-time defeat to Milan which ended their Italian Cup ambitions.

"It seems as if here they want to convince you that that's how it works, that you can perform below par, that it can happen," said Spalletti whose side focus on Serie A with no European football this season.

"Before there was total conviction in our qualities. You can see they can't recapture that. On a psychological level, we must turn a comer, and realise that we should do more."

Napoli stayed top for Christmas with captain Marek Hamsik scoring his 116th goal in a come-frombehind win against Sampdoria to overtake Argentine legend Diego Maradona as the club's all-time record goalscorer.

And the southerners are firmly on track to challenge reigning sixtime champions Juventus for their first Serie A title since the days of Maradona in 1987 and 1990.

"So far we have shown that we can achieve great results, but being ahead now counts very little, we have to head up to Crotone and give our best, there are three to four teams fighting for the summit," said Napoli's Brazilian midfielder Allan.

Puel seeks consistency from Leicester

LEICESTER - Leicester City's attractive style of play will count for little if they cannot find more consistency in the Premier League, Manager Claude Puel said.

Leicester have blended their counter attacking approach with a style that lays emphasis on possession and playing on the ground since the Frenchman took charge of the club in October.

While the resultant displays are pleas-

ing to the eye, Puel was keen to stress after the 2-1 loss to Watford on Tuesday that grinding out results was equally important.

"We try to play on the floor. We need to have more control in our games and we need to improve because it's important to have good results at the same time," Puel told the Leicester Mercury.

"When we won four games, it was a very good period, with quality. Always, we've played good games. Just against Crystal Palace, there was not enough concentration or quality.

"To continue this hard work on the pitch and to have good results for the confidence to improve, this is the most important thing."

Leicester, who are eighth in the table, are looking to end a run of three games without a victory when they take on fourth-placed Liverpool in the league tomorrow.

But, at the same time, Ferguson doesn't believe Mourinho will ever change his cautious ways.

Elite league players warned against festive tournaments

SOCCER-THE Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) has warned elite league players against taking part in festive season football tournaments.

In what is a trend now turned culture, some elite league football players have made it a habit of playing in the village tournaments, which has at times left them injured or fatigued when the league resumes. The PLS have vowed to tighten screws and monitor players to ensure they get rest and avoid unnecessary injuries ahead of the league return in January.

Club officials acknowledged that the trend affects their schedule and compromises their standards in the crucial moments of the league season. Matsapha United CEO Victor 'Mavikana' Dlamini spoke against players competing in social and betting tournaments pointing out that those players should understand that they are professionals.

"We will be having a short break this time around and expect players to rest in the few days of the festive season. We take care of our players and they understand that. Appropriate action will be taken against those breaching contractual guidelines. League break is meant for players to rest," he said.

Another spokesperson shared the same sentiments saying contractual obligations will guide their players to stay away from festive season tournaments. PLS Dumsani 'DU' Sibandze advised that festive season tournaments were mostly played under an aggressive atmosphere with high risks of injuries.


"Players are aware that social tournaments are risky as some do not respect the laws of the game and take it personal on the pitch. AS PLS we do not expect player to take part in these tournaments. It is a challenging matter but we appeal to players not to take part in stokvels," Sibandze

He said players were aware of what was expected from them and must refrain from festive season tournaments.

"Players owe services to clubs they are contracted to. We always advice players through the assistance of their teams to behave like professional on and off the pitch. Players train on their own during the festive break following schedule availed to them at respective clubs and there is no need for them to risk playing in games that do not have a future for them.

"Teams cannot afford to nurse injuries incurred from social tournaments. They are expected to rest and return fresh to complete their clubs' mission.

Soccer star George Weah wins Liberian presidential election

MONROVIA - Former soccer star George Weah has defeated Vice President Joseph Boakai to win Liberia's presidential runoff election and succeed incumbent Ellen Johnson Sirleaf next month, the country's first democratic transition in over 70 years.

With 98.1 per cent of the vote counted, wean led with 61.5 percent to Boakai's 38.5 per cent, National Election Commission Chairman Jerome Korkoyah told reporters in the capital Monrovia on yesterday.

At his party headquarters outside Monrovia, tears streamed down Weah's face as he greeted supporters from a balcony. Outside, young fans ran through the streets and blared car horns as dusk fell over the city.

"Success for George Weah is victory for the whole country," a 47-year-old engineer named Randall Zarkpah said as he walked home with his young son.

"When you feel sick for some time and you receive proper medication - that is how I feel now. He will be good for our country. He is King George!

Weah grew up in Clara Town slum in Monrovia and went on to become the only African to win FIFA World Player of the Year, starring for AC Milan, Paris St Germain and Chelsea.

His rags-to-riches story helped him tap into dissatisfaction with Johnson Sirleaf's 12-year tenure. Sirleaf drew a line under years of civil war but drew criticism for failing to root out corruption or



persistent poverty.

Weah's critics, however, say he has offered few concrete policy proposals. His choice of running mate Jewel Howard-Taylor - exwife of Charles Taylor, the former president and warlord serving 50 years in Britain for war crimes in neighboring Sierra Leone - has also raised eyebrows.

"I think Weah is not fit for the work. He will see it," said Anthony Mason, 34, who had gathered at the headquarters of Boakai's Unity Party for the results.
