



PROPHET MAGAYA TELLS PM HE WANTS TO INVEST IN SD

PRIME Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini has officially welcomed Prophet Walter Magaya and his wife Prophetess Tendai Magaya into the country.

This happened yesterday during a short event that took place at the Cabinet offices at Hospital Hill, Mbabane. Magaya, who hails from Zimbabwe, was in Dvokolwako on Wednesday to donate E1 million and 10 houses to Philani Maswati, a charity organisation whose patron is Her Majesty the Indlovukazi.

Magaya was introduced to the PM by Swaziland National Provident Fund Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Prince Lonkhokhela.

He was in the company of Ministry of Tnkhundla Principal Secretary (PS) Princess Gcebile, and Philani Maswati Chairman Lutfo Dlamini. Magaya is involved in many projects back in Zimbabwe and the projects include mining, construction, and other business initiatives.

The prime minister said what was done by Magaya was a great job because the Oueen Mother was at the forefront of human development in the country.

He told Magaya that Indlovukazi had a charity organisation (Philani Maswati) that wanted to make life easier for the elderly people in the country.

Nedbank's non-interest revenue slump by 14% to E69.4million

NEDBANK Swaziland's noninterest revenue has decreased by 14 per cent from E88.8 million in the previous year to E69.4 million for the half year ended June 2017.

This is according to the bank's half year results for the period between January and June 2017.

Non-interest revenue could be understood as creditor income derived primarily from fees including deposit and transaction fees, insufficient funds fees, annual fees, monthly account service charges; inactivity fees, check and deposit slip fees, and so on.

Conversely to the decrease of noninterest revenue, deposits reportedly increased by 15 per cent from E3 407 million to E3 928 million mostly twisted by wholesale bank-

The bank noted that it released its results at a time when the economy continued to take a hiding from global uncertainties as well as from domestic developments that has impacted growth.

The bank reported that its net interest income increased by 18 per cent to E131.6 million, mainly due to loans in the personal banking sec-

The bank also saw its headline earnings plunge by 16 per cent from just about E60.9 million to E50.9 million compared to the same period last year.

In a statement issued by the bank, Nedbank Managing Director Fikile Nkosi disclosed that they had anticipated a decline in headline earnings in their focus and budges But, she said they remain up that they will achieve growth forward.

"We, therefore, looked at enlar channels such as the digital of form. MY WIFE ABUSES ME-TVEDITOR

Dlamini revealed to the court that he suffered abuse from his wife and remained silent about it because it was not easy as a man to report about such an issue to the police

SWAZI TV News Editor Nkosinatsi Dlamini has denied ever assaulting his wife Lungile Makhanya.

Instead, the well-travelled Dlamini claimed that he is the one who has suffered endless abuse in silence in the hands of his wife and has scars all over his body to show for it.

Dlamini stated that the charges levelled against him are a result of fabricated lies by his wife, who is allegedly in cohorts with some of the investigating officers in the matter.

The newsman made his court appearance before Magistrate Lucia Lukhele at the Matsapha Circuit Court.

He was charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm late last

First to take the witness stand was public witness number three, officer Msimisi

He informed the court that it was not the first time he attended to the complainant (Makhanya) as she once reported an abuse incident before. The police officer stated that they offered counselling for the couple but were surprised when they saw them back at the police station for the same problem.

The accused, however, denied ever assaulting his wife and informed the court that he suspects that the bruises

which she had must have been selfinflicted by the complainant when she grabbed the steering wheel of the vehicle when he tried to drive to the police station to report assault.

Explaining his side of the story, Dlamini informed the court that he came back from work after five in the afternoon and found his wife not home. He said he proceeded to watch television until he fell asleep.

He said after 8pm his children woke him up complaining of hunger and he went to buy food for them.

Dlamini said he was told that someone was sitting at the doorsteps and found out it was his wife.

The accused told the court that his wife had started engaging in wayward behaviour such as turning their matrimonial homestead into a shebeen while he, on the other hand, doesn't drink or

He said he decided to request that she leaves and give him the house keys. The accused stated he did not get a response from his wife, hence he reached for her handbag trying to get the house keys and that is when a scuffle ensued.

Dlamini stated that at that moment his wife bit him on his back, leaving him seriously scarred.

He stated that he then decided to go to the police station and the reason for doing so was because it was not the first time such happened and he was always labelled the aggressor.

Dlamini revealed to the court that he

suffered abuse from his wife and remained silent about it because it was not easy as a man to report about such an issue to the police.

Dlamini stated that he has old and fresh scars all over his body which are inflicted by his wife.

He stated that even on the day of the incident, when he went to the police station, officers were puzzled that he was there to open a case against his wife.

He said it took some time for him to receive help and when he finally did he was helped by a female police officer who identified herself as detective Ndlangamandla.

The accused stated that, however, what saddens him is that the cases which he reported against his wife never saw the light of the day. Dlamini said he suspects that his wife's relatives, who are police officers, used their influence to make sure that the matters did not make it to court.

It also surfaced in court that since the accused opened a case against his wife for assault the same case is being handled by the same investigator and the same prosecutor, which is something that puzzled the magistrate as to how such happened.

The court has since postponed the matter and asked the attorney for the accused to furnish him with statements recorded by the accused for his previous cases which he opened with the police.

Govt owes Manzini City E17m in rates

GOVERNMENT'S arrears in rates at the Manzini Municipal Council has shot up from E4 million in 2016 to E17 million in 2017.

This shocking figure was revealed by Manzini Acting City Treasurer Mfanafuthi Mamba yesterday during a stakeholders meeting at The George Hotel.

Mamba said this when presenting the financials of the 2016/17 annual report for the municipality.

Stakeholders who attended the meeting raised concerns about such a huge debt by government.

They wanted to know what council is doing about the non-payment of rates by government.

In response, Chief Executive Officer Lungile Dlamini said they are working on the issue.

She said they engaged government who promised to raise the owed funds.

During the meeting, the stakeholders said it was about time the Council considered having their own police officers (Metro police) just like in other countries and the money collected from fines would go to the Municipality instead of going to government's coffers.

OVER 2 000 PUPILS BENEFIT FROM JA PROGRAMMES

OVER 2 000 pupils including those from rural areas have benefited in this year's Junior Achievement programmes.

This was commended by Prime Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini during the JA annual National Expo held yesterday.

Dlamini said Cabinet takes a very serious view of the importance of schemes such as JA, ENACTUS and Kick-Start, saying these entities hold potential to contribute towards sustainable growth.

Galp supervisor arrested for E80 000 theft

A supervisor for Big Tree Filling Station (Galp) at Matsapha has been accused of stealing E80 322 while working for the compa-

Sphelele Ellen Ndlela made her court appearance yesterday at the Matsapha Circuit Court before Magistrate Lucia Lukhele.

She faced a charge of theft in that while she was working as a supervisor for Big Tree Filling Station also known as Galp, she allegedly stole money amounting to E80

A court record noted that the accused was an agent of Matsapha branch and entrusted with the care and custody of the said money which belonged to Galp.

It is alleged that the money stolen by the accused was in the possession of Sicelo Mkhabela. During her court appearance yesterday, the accused was remanded back to police custody.

She was further advised to get the services of an attorney the next time she comes to court.

The accused requested for bail from the magistrate, however, she was advised that due to the amount involved in the case, it would be wise that she request for bail during her next appearance which is October 4. Lukhele informed the accused that this was because if she as a magistrate was to give the accused bail, she would fix it at half the amount of the money which has been reported to have been stolen which would be around E40 000. The magistrate said she doubted that the accused would have that money. The accused was then remanded back into police cus-

Ex-convicts' fingerprints to be valid for a specific period

FORMER convicts are expected to breathe a sigh of relief as fingerprints and records of previous convictions will be valid for a certain period of time.

Currently, former-offenders' records are used against them such that they are sometimes not given opportunities of being employed, regardless of when they committed the crime.

In short, the records, as things stand, are valid for an unlimited period of

This resulted in the overwhelming outcry of members of the public on the negative impact of the use of fingerprints or previous conviction records of ex-offenders. What made matters worse for the public was that the fingerprints were used without considering the time when the crime was committed.

Even if the ex-offenders had served their sentences, they were victimised, based on their fingerprints.

The August House is now in the process of passing the Criminal Procedure and Evidence (Amendment) Bill No. 08 of 2015. The House portfolio committee of the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs has finished deliberating on the Bill. On Wednesday, the committee was tabling a report on how it deliberated on the amendments.

Minister for Justice and Constitutional

Affairs Edgar Hillary told the members of the portfolio committee that the aim of the bill was to control the accessibility and regulate the use by providing a time frame within which the record of previous convictions could be used.

"The status quo resulted in the exoffenders being disadvantaged or punished for their offences for the rest of their lives. This has been, more often than not, the case in the eligibility for scholarships and securing of jobs in certain fields or disciplines," Hillary said. He went on to say no matter how petty the crimewas, the circumstances that prevailed at the time and the time that had lapsed, the record would sometimes prove to be detrimental to the livelihood of an ex-offender. The minister believed that the amendment

would address the discrepancy and the record of previous convictions would only be used in the regulated circumstances.

This is how the fingerprint records are to be regulated:

• The records of a previous conviction of a child offender will be valid for a period of three years, beginning from the last day of serving the sen-

 After the expiry date of three years, the records of a precious conviction of a child offender can only be disclosed and used for purposes of crime detection, investigation of an offence or for the use in prosecution.

 The validity of a previous conviction, except for a child, shall be determined by the length of the sen-

Man arrested for killing cousin in dagga fields

A Bulandzeni based businessman has been arrested and charged with the murder of his cousin while in dagga fields in the northern Hhohho region.

Vusi Mduduzi Dlamini is alleged to have used his illegal firearm in the murder of his cousin Thembinkosi Magagula who was, after the killing left in the dagga fields for three weeks before his body was found after being reported missing. According to the charge sheet, Dlamini of Bulandzeni under Chief Ndlaluhlaza allegedly committed the offence at a farm where dagga growers use for their illegal herb trade.

The accused aged 36, was in the company of the deceased when the incident happened. Yesterday, Dlamini filed an urgent bail application at the High Court where he appeared before Judge Ticheme Dlamini.

In his bail application, he claimed that he did not kill the deceased person, but was in his company together with his brother Nkosingphile and another cousin, Njabulo Nhlabatsi and were in search of his heard of cattle that had gone missing. He claimed that his cousin advised him that the cattle had strayed to a government cattle ranch at Ebulandzeni, hence he sought the company of the three in search of the cattle.

He said the place where the

cattle had been seen was known for dagga growing, thus he decided to carry with him his illegal firearm for their own protection and that they searched until the night when they decided to abandon the search. However, on their way back the accused person claimed they decided to take a short cut since they were exhausted and found themselves trespassing on dagga fields and whilst in the middle of the dagga fields, they heard three gunshots fired at close range. "Trying to scare whosoever was shooting at us I, in turn fired my firearm in the air and at that time everyone ran helter skater and without taking due consideration of who was missing I took cover in hiding," the accused stated in his affidavit.

It later transpired they were

being shot at by Mozambican nationals who had been manning the dagga fields, and following the shooting incident, he was subsequently arrested and charged for illegal possession of a firearm and was admitted to bail fixed at E2 000 by the Piggs Peak Magistrate's Court. He said he was granted bail while the crown was awaiting a ballistic report taken from the scene of crime and while out on bail, it transpired that one person was missing and that was the deceased and as a result a search team was commissioned and he was found in the dagga fields.

It was not until on Tuesday September 26, 2017 that he was called by the investigating officer Inspector DuPont who informed him at Buhleni Police Post that the ballistic report was back from South Africa and advised him that its results were positive to his illegal firearm. To that end, he was subsequently charged with the murder of the deceased hence he has filed the urgent bail application pending his date with the court for the charge of murder which he stated would plead not guilty to.

Man barred at Bulandzeni, admitted to E50 000 bail

ALTHOUGH the businessman was granted bail fixed at E50 000 after filing his urgent application, the Court was however left with questions on why he failed to report his cousin as missing

after the incident He was ordered to pay E8 000 in cash and E42 000 in a form of a surety and his relatives placed a car as surety to that amount. High Court Judge Ticheme Dlamini before admitting the murder suspect to bail, however, questioned his Lawyer Nhlanhla Ginindza on why the accused person despite the deceased being missing for three weeks, failed to report him since he was the last one to see him.

The Crown represented by counsel Sizwe Matsebula shared the same sentiment, hence he submitted that the accused who had been initially charged under the fourth schedule offences, had to be charged under the fifth schedule, hence he applied that the bail amount be fixed at an amount as per the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act (CPE). The accused's lawyer Ginindza, however, submitted that such a question was subject to trial as he felt that it was now a situation of a trial within a trial. However, in his submission when making the bail application, the accused person said the news of his cousin's death came as shock to him adding that there was no way he could have taken the life of his own

being admitted to bail pending hearing of his trial as he has dependents (six) and an elderly mother who need his care and support, if admitted on bail he stated that he would abide by all conditions. When admitting him to bail Judge Dlamini ordered that the accused person should not in anyway set foot at Bulandzeni until such a time that situation has calmed down as deemed fit by the court. He was ordered to stay with his other relatives in Matsapha and report to the Sigodvweni Police station and abide by the normal bail conditions. By the time this report his bail had already been paid by his relatives and was expected to have been released by late afternoon at the Piggs Peak He said he was desirous of Correctional facility.





TIPS FOR TRAVELLERS Preparing Yourself For A Flight

Hand luggage: This is a small bag to which you will have access throughout your journey as it is the only one that will be allowed inside the cabin with you. In here must be all your comfort items such as hand lotion, perfume and lip balm. Their important consideration to

make is that all airports are under a security regulation not to allow liquid and gel containers of over 100ml to go through in this bag. Keep all such items in the smallest possible quantity. Anything that is above the maximum volume will be forfeited and destroyed by airport security. Your hand luggage is the safest bag as it is guaranteed to be with you all the time. It is advisable to keep your treasured valuables such as laptops and cameras in the hand luggage.

Main luggage:Pack like a minimalist. Most airlines restrict your baggage to a maximum of 23 kilograms in

Economy class and 30 kilograms in Business. When packing, be careful not to exceed all this. All luggage goes through the security scan so do not pack things whose legality you are not sure of. There is a heavy price to pay if caught on the wrong side of the law and the responsibility is yours.

Possible loss luggage: A painful consideration to make when packing is that there is a widespread loss of bags and valuable items at airports in many parts of the world, especially in our region. This can be through baggage theft or accidental loss due to the processing of thousands of bags at busy airports. When travelling do not pack your best items. We all have that suit, that dress or that pair of shoes which no money can replace. Don't take these

with you. It is also common to temporarily lose your main luggage and have it arrive at your destination a day or two after your arrival. It is advisable to make sure that you pack emergency clothing on your hand luggage to mitigate this risk. Imagine two days without

Your Physical Body: if you can dress for the journey in comfortable, simple and casual clothes. Remember it can get cold in the aircraft so do allow for this. There are intense body searches through airport security involving hand and electronic metal screening. If you can avoid wearing something with metal including heavy shoes, watches and belts you will experience less inconvenience.

Wear sneakers or shoes that are easy to take on & off. Wear track suits or jeans without a belt. You will find that you pass through the metal detectors more easily without being asked to remove items in your body.

Be on time. Check in two or three hours ahead of flight schedule. It can only be one hour but

never less than that. With all the customs, bags and security processes that must take place every passenger passing through the airport, it is not exaggerated to say that you will need all this time ahead of departure. Many people who have ignored the time factor have painful

tales to tell.

Do not be one of them. Stick to the principle that your primary school teacher tried very hard to instil. "Be on time".

Consider the following tips and make it through airport security faster and easier the next time you fly:

- Have your ticket & passport out before you approach the security agent
- Get your laptop out before it is your turn to load on your conveyor belt
- Do not leave items of baggage

unattended

- Do not place dangerous goods in your baggage
- Do not accept baggage for carriage from other persons
- If you already have, declare it to the airline (you may be carrying dangerous goods, devices or other items exposing you to danger and/or criminal prosecution as an unwitting accomplice)
- Report any unattended baggage or parcels to the security or airline persons

ADDITIONAL CHARGES WORRY JUDGE NKOSI

HIGH Court Judge Sipho Nkosi has expressed concern over the additional charges of murder instituted by the crown in its amended charge sheet for the four suspect rhino poachers.

Judge Nkosi, who was supposed to hear the urgent bail application filed by three of the suspects, wondered from the crown as to how the four suspects; Stanley Nhlakalufu, Isaac Mkhabela, Muzi Dlamini and Sipho Mhlanga have now been charged with the murder of two suspected poachers they were with in the alleged poaching.

This, after he noted that the shooting that resulted in the death of two Mozambican nationals who were allegedly part of the team of poachers, was directly made by the rangers and the police officers.

He ordered the crown represented by Crown Counsel Patrick Mkhatshwa to assist the court in giving evidence that

the suspect poachers were directly involved in the murder of their colleagues as seemingly none such has been brought before court.

Judge Nkosi ordered that Mkhatjwa files his heads of argument together with a bundle of authorities that would have cases that indicates that the suspects are directly and not indirectly linked with the killing of their colleagues.

This was after Mkhatshwa had submitted that he has authorities to support the link of the suspects with murder in a dolus eventualis scenario.

For purposes of the bail application, the court stated that it is not convinced that the ranger Fana Mbatha was not part of the alleged poaching as he could not have conducted a one-man sting

Judge Nkosi further stated that the charge of murder is more confusing to the court as the deceased persons were shot and killed by the rangers and the police at Hlane.

The crown argued that the two Mozambican nationals would not have been killed had the four suspects not been part of the rhino poaching deal and were present at the scene.



'Frustrating my clients leaves a lot to be desired'

DEFENCE attorney Machawe Sithole says the manner in which the crown is frustrating his clients by adding more charges leaves a lot to be desired.

Sithole is representing the four suspect rhino poachers.

He made this submission on Wednesday before Judge Nkosi as he said the charges that amount to 14 preferred against his clients did not form part of the initial charge of Contravening the Game Act.

Sithole said the inclusion of the other charges were not in any way relevant to the charge of Contravening the Game Act, as such should not have been added by the crown. He said the first accused person Stanley Nhlakalufu stated clearly in his affidavit when making his bail application at the Magistrate Court's as to what transpired in the whole attempted poaching deal.

Sithole said his clients were not at the scene of crime when the shooting happened and further that one of his clients who was shot at the scene cheated death himself as he was shot by the rangers

and police, only to be now charged together with the three for the murder of their colleagues.

"My Lord the manner in which the crown is frustrating my clients by adding more charges leaves a lot to be desired as the charges added are not at all relevant to the charge of the alleged poaching," Sithole submitted.

Bail

The three suspect rhino poachers, who have filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court, have had more charges added by the crown as they are now facing serious charges of Contravening the Prevention of Terrorism Act.

To add on that, the crown has also added another of Contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act 2006, in that they allegedly colluded with Fana Mbatha, the ranger, in gaining access to the game park in order to poach a rhino.

They are also charged with the murder of the two Mozambican nationals who were killed during the alleged

poaching. According to the amended charged sheet, the four suspects are guilty of the crime of Contravening the Prevention of Terrorism Act and that of Contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act 2006, amongst eight more counts added by the crown.

Shooting

Although the four suspects were not the ones who killed their two counterparts during the alleged shooting, the crown submitted that in a dolus eventualis case, the four are guilty of the charge of murder since the two would not have been killed had they (accused persons) not be the ones orchestrating the poaching.

Meanwhile, the three will know their fate today as Judge Nkosi postponed the matter for final arguments. He said this was the last and final postponement given to allow the crown to file its papers and ordered that by yesterday at 1630 hours, the crown should have filed same and the defence ready to finalise the matter.

Child rejects mother in cour

AFTER all has been said and done, Nokuphila Nkonyane went back home dejected following her child's refusal to go with her.

The social welfare team had accompanied her to Herefords where the child is being looked after by the family of the father. However, she came back empty handed as it is said the child failed to recognise her and cried hysterically when she attempted to go with her.

Therefore, the social workers advised her to leave the child behind as forcefully going with her would negatively affect the child. She was advised to give the child time to bond with her and get used to her before taking her to be under her custody.

SWAZI MED ADAMANT THAT DR LUKOJI REMAINS SUSPENDED

FOLLOWING an urgent application filed by Manzini based private medical practitioner Dr Tshibungu Jean Lukoji against his suspension as direct payee at Swazi Med, the latter insists that the doctor is still suspended.

Last week, High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi advised both parties to have a meeting where they would discuss a proposal offered by Swazi Med.

The Medical Aid Scheme had proposed that Dr Lukoji could provide service to its members, but payment could not be made to him directly, instead the members would in turn file claims for same.

However, when both parties appeared in court on Wednesday, it transpired that they had not reached a consensus as Swazi Med, through its lawyers senior attorney Mangaliso Magagula and Nolwazi Kunene from Magagula/ Hlophe Attorneys, insisted that the doctor remained suspended.

They submitted that there has been a long standing rule within the scheme which is used in working with service providers and such entails its members being treated by doctors of their own choice and later lodge claims with the scheme personally as members.

They stated that Swazi Med bent backwards for members and owed its existence to them since it was not a profit driven scheme, and even when it makes profits, same are ploughed back to the fund and could not act contrary to the interest of its members.

They submitted that Swazi Med took the decision to suspend Dr Lukoji to protect its members and the scheme, and has no intention whatsoever to cause harm as indicated that the rules allow that members could make a direct claim without having to pay cash.

In any event, according to Swazi Med, a service provider was not paid cash when rendering service to Swazi Med members but submits a bill payable at the end of the month.

They argued that it is in the best interest of the members of the scheme to have their monies protected and as managers of the scheme, Swazi Med could not allow a situation where the alleged fraudulent claims occur.

Seeing that both parties were not in agreement, Judge Nkosi allowed them to again meet outside Court D and find a lasting solution that would be in the interest of both the members and the doctor.

However, when they returned to court, lawyer Magagula submitted that Dr Lukoji remained suspended.

He said from what they discussed with the other party, it was evident that Dr Lukoji still wants to be a direct payee, a thing which Swazi Med could not allow.

Lawyer Jose Rodrigues for Dr Lukoji then submitted that they were not in agreement with Swazi Med and applied that the matter be postponed to a later date for full-blown arguments in the application filed by Dr Lukoji.

Dr Lukoji had submitted that he now fears that his private practice might shut down following his suspension. This, he said, might result to his children who are in university being forced to drop out due to financial constrains, following his continued suspension.

Swazi Med has proposed that same should apply with Dr Lukoji and its members as there is nothing preventing him from providing service to its members, save for the fact that he would no longer be a direct payee as it was the case before. The previous status quo would allow Dr Lukoji to provide service to Swazi Med's members and directly file claims in respect of the treatment administered.

Man threatens baby mama with lawyer

A parent defaulting in child maintenance threatened his baby mama with a lawyer following allegation of mismanagement of funds.

Madoda Ndlovu made allegations that Nomphumelelo Dlamini, together with her grandmother, was constantly collecting money from him on different occasions for his child.

He said this confused him as the mother of his child was now married to another man and the child was under the custody of her grandmother. "She is taking my money for her own use Your Worship, the right person who should be collecting the money is her grandmother not her," he said. However, it seemed Ndlovu met his match as a livid Dlamini told the court that Ndlovu was good for nothing as he has failed to look after his own child, thus allowing another man to raise his child.

While speaking at the top of her voice, Dlamini further alleged that Ndlovu has always been shying away from responsibility since the birth of their child.

"He told me that his lawyer would deal with me and that angered me very much because I do not want his lawyer but him to look after his child. He is relaxed while another man is looking after his child. I tried reaching out to him but he kept ignoring me and I was forced to come here," she said. When Ndlovu produced his proof of earnings, Magistrate Sfiso Vilak was left shocked that the man earned less that E1 000 after deductions yet he is expected to contribute E800 towards the upbringing of the child. He ordered him to contribute E600 while telling him that he would be left with nothing because he had been dodging the law.

Man attacks woman at Yemfo Bar, steals her E100

A 37-year-old man made yet another appearance in court in less than a year for assaulting and robbing a woman of her items.

Jabulani Dlamini of Jubukweni was disappointed when Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati recognised his face and indeed, he confirmed that he once appeared before him for a different charge. This time around, Dlamini is facing three criminal charges said to have been committed on Monday.

It is alleged that he attacked one Nomsa Mtsetfwa, who was enjoying her alcoholic drinks at Yemfo Bar, and stole her money amounting to E100. Dlamini allegedly assaulted her with open hands several times on the face and body before hitting her with a fist on her stomach, thus causing her injuries. The assault is said to have come after he was confronted about the missing money. It is alleged Dlamini continued with his violent behavior when the police were called to the scene of crime as he refused to be arrested. He was charged with theft, assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm and resisting arrest. When he appeared in court, he was granted bail fixed at E1 000.

Robbery suspects granted E10 000 bail

TWO men who are facing charges of armed robbery have each been granted bail fixed at E5 000.

Lucky Thulani Dube (25) of Gege and Mongi Dlamini (29) of Mbekelweni appeared before Magistrate Sifiso Vilakati after being arrested in connection with the armed robbery that took place at Thembelihle on September 15.

It is alleged they acted jointly and in a furtherance of a common purpose wherein they wrongfully, unlawfully and with intent to induce submission to the taking of items valued at E16 450, threatened Bheki Shabangu that unless he consented to the taking of the items and refrain from any resistance, they would shoot him with the gun they were allegedly car-

The stolen items included a laptop valued at E6 000, a J2 Samsung cellphone valued at E3 000, sneakers valued at E2 500, a flash drive, a gold wedding ring valued at E4 500 and money in cash amounting to E300.



When they made their appearance in court, they were represented by Noncedo Ndlangamandla of Mabila Attorneys in association with N. Ndlangamandla and S. Jele. She told the court that the suspects were innocent until proven guilty.

She further asked the court not to apply Section 102 of the Criminal and Procedure which states that accused persons should be granted bail that is half the amount of the stolen items. She assured the court that the suspects will not evade trial as they were innocent, and further suggested to the court to hand out strict bail conditions to monitor their movements. The court granted them E5 000 bail each and further warned them to appear before court today.

Wife desperately wants marriage nullified

A woman desperately wants to divorce her first love and has since approached the Supreme Court to expedite such.

Phindile Masuku (appellant) has approached the Supreme Court following an order issued by the High Court to the effect that her civil rights marriage still subsists.

The appellant and her husband, Masiko Dlamini, are already in separation and it transpired at the Supreme Court yesterday that the two, after getting married through the Swazi Custom, proceeded to marrying though civil rights and they had both *teka* and civil marriage certificates. Represented by senior attorney Ben J Simelane, the appellant (Masuku) submitted that already their marriage through Swazi custom has been nullified at the Royal Kraal (*umphakatsi*) confirmed it

Simelane told the court that both parties were no longer in love, and had already separated. All the appel-

lant wants, according to Simelane, was for the formal and final decree of divorce, arguing that the fact that the marriage has been nullified under Swazi Custom meant it no longer exists. However, when the appellant approached the High Court to have a declaratory order that the marriage had been nullified in accordance with Swazi Custom, the court a quo (High Court) discovered that the two in fact proceeded to marry through civil rights and that such was never annulled and confirmed by any court, hence their marriage still subsists. It was for that reason that the appellant has now approached the Supreme Court appealing against the decision made by the High Court to that effect. Representing the respondent in the matter was lawyer Thulani Mamba from Mkhwananzi Attorneys.

The Supreme Court comprising Justices Dr Odoki, Majahenkhaba Dlamini and Robert Cloete heard submissions which mostly came from the appellant and after the submissions reserved judgment for a later date to be communicated to both counsel.

Stop child brutality now, teachers warned

WHILE reports of pupils getting injured and sometimes paralysed at the hands of teachers continue to dominate local media, the ministry of education and training maintains that corporal punishment remains banned.

A recent incident occured at Ekuphakameni Community Primary School where a boy lost his eye after a splinter from a stick got into his eye and damaged it. During the speech and prize giving day at Mphundle High School, Schools Inspector Gugu Dlamini warned teachers against going against the ministry's orders which banned corporal punishment. Dlamini was representing the regional education office.

Dlamini said the ministry was worried by reports of pupils getting injured at school, a place where they are expected to be kept safe. She emphasised that the ministry decided to ban corporal punishment as a way to prevent such incidents where a pupil would be injured. Dlamini said it appeared that some teachers were frustrated by personal issues, and would vent their frustrations on the children, injuring them in the process. "Teachers must just stop this brutality at once and avoid incidents where the ministry will then be dragged to court after a pupil has been injured," said Dlamini.

However, Dlamini said pupils also have a responsibility to behave accordingly. She said in this regard, teachers had a duty to create a friendly environment for the pupils so that they may voice out their problems without fear or intimidation.

Ill-disciplined pupils a serious problem at Mphundle High

TEACHERS at Mphundle High School have complained of illdiscipline amongst pupils at the school, saying that it was one of the numerous challenges they face.

Principal Phumzile Nkumane-Dlamini said teachers were finding it difficult to execute their duties, especially with pupils who have no respect for them.

She said the situation was further aggravated by some parents who would side with the pupils whenever they are informed of their behaviour.

Some pupils were said to have taken advantage of the fact that corporal punishment was abolished, and would conduct themselves as they please.

Meanwhile, the principal further reported that the school was faced with a serious challenge of a shortage of teachers' houses. She said the few available houses at the quarters were now dispidated, and were a health hazed to the teachers. Apparently, this one complaint which was one raised by the teachers who are accommodated at the quarters. They disclosed that some of the houses had become bee hives. This was reportedly the samestuation for some classes at the

Nonetheless, the principal commended teachers at the school for remaining committed to their work despite the challenges. She for their thanked Matsanjeni North MP Phila Buthelezi for supporting the school and providing incentives to excelling pupils. She pointed out that this has improved the performance of the pupils, especially in external classes.

Police Bill might be amended by senators

THE Police Service Bill might be amended by senators to provide for the existence of an independent police investigating organisation.

This comes after Mangcongco MP Patrick 'Pha' Motsa approached the senators with an intention to include the independent police investigating body.

The organisation would probe the work of the police, especially during incidents whereby members of the public would find themselves at the receiving end of police brutality.

The Police Service Bill is currently in Parliament, where it awaits to be passed by senators to become the Police Service Act.

The Bill was passed by the House of Assembly in April this year. It was passed without the inclusion of the independent body to investigate police.

When asked if he was successful in lobbying senators to amend the Bill on Tuesday, Motsa said he raised the matter with senators.

He said senators promised to help in raising the matter during the debate at Senate.

However, he did not want to divulge names of those he spoke with. This was not well received by MP Motsa. He



raised the matter in the House of Assembly. **Provision**

Unfortunately for him, the provision for the investigating organisation was not granted. Motsa, during that submission in Parliament, argued that there were many cases where people died at the hands of the police. It was unfortunate that there was no independent organisation set up to investigate such incidents, hence the need for an independent body to perform such tasks. Motsa then made an example of an accident where Reginaldo Luciano Zavale, a Mozambican national, reportedly died at the hands of the police. Other cases included that of Sipho Jele and 'MaThousand' Ngubane.

They were also reported to have died at the hands of the police.

Speaking to this publication after the sitting, Motsa said the time had come for the country to set up such a body for the citizens of the country to get justice if they found themselves at the receiving end of police brutality.

What was unfortunate, according to Motsa, was that the investigations of most, if not all, of these cases did not see the light of day.

He made an example of South Africa, where he said police were not allowed to investigate themselves, but an independent body would investigate police during such incidents.

The MP promised that he would lobby his colleagues in the upper chamber to amend the bill so that the independent body could also be included.

Emotional abuse on the rise-SWAGAA

THE Swaziland Action Group Against Abuse (SWAGAA) says emotional abuse continued to be a major form of abuse in the month of August.

A report from SWAGAA stated that when compared to other forms of abuse, emotional abuse cases reported were high. The statistics were drawn from psychosocial services rendered by the SWAGAA to survivors in Manzini, One Stop Centre in Mbabane and Mbabane GOVERNMENT HOSPITAL. This also includes clients attended through the Umliba Loya Embili Project. SWAGAA Monitoring and Evaluation Officer Mcolisi Dlamini said emotional and verbal abuse cases were followed by sexual, physical and neglect was the least. "There were 28 recorded cases of emotional abuse, 13 cases of physical abuse, seven of financial abuse, 15 cases of sexual abuse and nine cases of neglect", he said. There were 46 survivors in the Manzini region who reported abuse related cases, 10 in Hhohho, Lubombo 12 and four in Shiselweni. "There were 53 female and 19 male clients who

reported abuse and post abuses vices this month. In relation to po petrator profile, there were 55 m perpetrators and 17 female per trators reported," he said. Dlan further disclosed that relatives remains the main perpetrators of violence These include parents, children cousins, in-laws, uncles, aunts step-parents. "Home continues be the predominant place when most of the reported abuse case took place. SILILO ROAD 90% COMPLETE

Fuel attendants forced to buy new uniforms

ABOUT 13 fuel attendants at a fuel station in Pigg's Peak are crying foul after being made to buy their own new uniforms.

This is because the fuel station is rebranding, thus the new uniforms would be purchased by the attendants themselves.

The aggrieved attendants approached this publication on Wednesday.

They said they were shocked to hear that they would be paying for their new uniforms on a monthly basis.

"As the fuel station is now rebranding, we will have to pay for our own uniforms, that is according to our administrator who spoke to us last month. We are aggrieved by this situation.

We will not be able to pay for the uniforms as we get paid only E1 300 as a basic salary," one of the fuel attendants who preferred anonymity said.

They said the administration notified them that they would first buy safety boots at a cost of E300 a pair.

The administration also informed the fuel attendants that E60 would be deducted from their wages monthly for 10 months.

Meanwhile, Assistant Manager at the fuel station Zanele Dlamini confirmed that the staff would pay for the boots but not the new uniforms. "It is not true that the fuel stations staff will be charged for the new uniforms. We will charge them for the boots only, because the staff often use their boots anywhere not just at work.

The station cannot repossess the boots when an employee leaves, these technically belong to the staff," she said.

New education APP enhances learning

THERE is a new education online programme which will make learning for pupils as well as teachers' work much easier and convenient, whether in class or at home.

The programme is a smart academic application (app) known as SZ4ME (formerly known as Swazishield4me).

It encourages pupil-teacher, parent-pupil and parent-pupil-teacher interactions.

One of the founders of the programme, which has been rolled out in some of the schools in the Shiselweni region, Lungelo Dlamini, said this was new technology which was in line with vision 2022.

The advantages and benefits of the programme included that a learner who was absent from school or



missed classes for whatever reason, could still catch up. It would benefit even struggling learners, especially slow-learners. It would be accessed anywhere in the country, as long as he or she is logged in, there would be no hassles to seek help from teachers or colleagues.

"Learners can access all class activities, wherever they are and at anytime. Even in the event a learner misses school or any lesson because of other reasons, he or she can still catch up.

Even if one misses classes for a week or more, he or she can still access what was discussed or learnt on that day or period. "The needed information or anything discussed is loaded or stored in the gadget to go through it at his convenience at home or anywhere," said Dlamini, one of the experts in the programme.

Dlamini said all users would have no problem of accessing anything they want to know in class even when they were not in school.

"You just click the search zone and you get whatever you are looking for pertaining to your subjects.

It is also a programme which assists learners to gauge themselves before exams.

It also helps learners to attend class with their colleagues from other schools to share ideas, thus passing knowledge to one another," he said.

Dlamini said teachers as well stand to benefit from the programme and as they could also teach while they are at home or away from the school.

Feature

"The application has a 'post ahead feature' and it's when the teacher

can give the learners background of that lesson before it's covered in class," said Dlamini.

The programme would also help parents to know how their child are performing in class and also identify areas the child has to improve on. "Parents will get analysis of teachers on the child's performance and also progress in tests or exams or when a school can be engaged for any information should there be need," said Dlamini.

The launch of the programme, according to Dlamini is planned to be anytime this week at Engudzeni High School. "We expect the officially launch to take place tomorrow (Wednesday). Otherwise, this programme started in 2013 at Engudzeni FEA High School," said Dlamini.

The ministry of information and communications technology (ICT) was expected to be represented during the launch.

DVOKODVWENI Constituency has donated a tent worth E21 000 to the youth of Macetjeni in the Lubombo region.



I would have been happier if in her damning statement Dlamini had said as police officers they do not need the cost of living.


She should have been more forthright and told the world that as police officers they do not need the 9.15% being negotiated between the public sector unions and the Government Negotiation Team (GNT).



WITHIN a space of two weeks one man gruesomely killed his wife by beheading her before hiding her head under rocks.

Now it is an irate husband who killed a schoolboy after finding him naked apparently having strayed into the sacred and forbidden territories of his marital sanctuary, the conjugal fittings.

In both instances these are nothing but crimes of passion or could we simply side with the perpetrators by concluding, albeit this early, that enough is enough with the cheats, it is time to kill the mangy dog?

A crime of passion (French:crime passionnel), in popular usage, refers to a violent crime, especially homicide, in which the perpetrator commits the act against someone because of sudden strong impulse such as sudden rage rather than as a premeditated crime.

The courts have the monopoly to determine the circumstance in which these heinous killings happened and also to make the relevant conclusions whether these are irrational, rational or legal, who cares? The bottom line is that two young lives have been taken by other human beings in a fit of anger.

Those accused of the killings are male adults. Having asked around I discovered that women, on average, claim that they would have acted differently under the circumstances, such as screaming or carrying both arms on top of their head.

However she missed the bus and returned to find her boyfriend in the loving arms of another woman.

The Romeo reasoned with her lover that she should allow the stranger woman to spend the night since it was already late and it being a high crime area she would simply leave in the morning. He decided to sleep in the middle while his lovers took the sides, one would

have anticipated a threesome but there was nothing of the sort. In the middle of the night the steady girlfriend woke up to boil cooking oil

and spilled it on the faces of the

Prior to that a married man was informed of his wife's infidelity and decided to catch the two in the act. When he broke the door open he immediately fired a shot but missed the two. He was also armed with a very sharp knife, decided that he was ending the drama once and forever. He ordered his wife to cut off his lover's manhood or the bullet would go right through her head, she settled for the former!

The other case was the (in) famous 'stuck-on-you' that involved a Manzini man who worked for the sugar plantations in the Lubombo region whereby the husband used black magic so that his member got stuck as he committed adultery and therefore he could not withdraw the manhood.

The pair was taken before a national court president where it was ruled that the husband be called to free them especially because such magic spells had been banned in Swaziland. The husband on arrival simply said 'ayisuke' this being a shout to send a straying dog away; that is how the two were freed.

Then at Nhlambeni a cop killed in cold blood his wife after finding her with a businessman on his bed but surprisingly this cop walked.

About half a decade ago at Hlane marula festival a Form Five pupil was caught by warriors with a woman old enough to be his mother. He had made her cling to a tree trunk as he came from behind oblivious of all that happened around them, the pair got a hiding and a humiliation of a lifetime, we do not know to this day how that case ended.

When I looked at them I felt a weight much heavier than when I had the rope all trembling from being so stretched with the creaking of bones trying to escape from my hands, and with the whines that came out in squeaks, smothered in his closed mouth.

Lovemore Ranga Mataire wrote three years ago that the mangy dog story was centred on a stray dog afflicted by disease, helpless, and almost dying. He begins to identify with the dog, which like him is also an outcast among other dogs, and he develops compassion and sympathy for the mutt.

Ginho and his group are manipulated by Senhor Duarte into killing the dog and liken the act as a kind of hunting game. Ginho is chosen to shoot the dog.

Even though he is emotionally attached to the dog, the pressure from other boys forces him to eliminate the dog for the sake of being accepted.

After many pleas with the other children, he is unsuccessful in trying to save the dog. The story end with a guilty confession despite his reluctance to participate in the crime

The "Mangy Dog" may be likened to a sick decadent colonial system that must be destroyed in order to make way for a new reality of existence, free of discrimination and racism.

"Mangy Dog" is shot to death with firearms in a symbolically pointing to the way Mozambique was to gain its independence through the use of military force.

Come to think of it, could this be 2 000 years after the Christian civilisation, the ideal way to deal with infidelity? To what extent must we be expected to exercise self-restrain or what is expected of us if we lose it? What happens when we let loost of our morals especially where inerperienced minors are involved?

COFFEE DOES NOT TREAT PARKINSON

COFFEE may not relieve the symptoms of Parkinson's disease after all, a new study sug-

Research published in the journal Neurology in 2012 suggested that caffeine may help reduce movement symptoms for people with Parkinson's disease.

However, a more in-depth investigation has shown that the beverage did nothing to alleviate sufferers' crippling symptoms.

Study author Dr Ronald Postuma, of McGill University in Canada, said, "Caffeine, which is so safe and inexpensive, has been linked to a reduced risk of developing Parkinson's.

"So it was exciting to think that it could possibly help people who already have the disease."

The new study involved 121 people with an average age of 62 who had been diagnosed with Parkinson's for an average of four years.

Of those, half were given a 200milligram capsule of caffeine twice daily, once in the morning and once after lunch, the equivalent of three cups of coffee per day, while the other half were given placebo capsules. To help them adjust to the caffeine, the dose was increased slowly, starting with placebo and ...Study refutes myth that a jolt of caffeine can relieve debilitating symptoms



reaching 200 milligrams at week nine. The study participants were followed for six to 18 months.

The researchers found there was no improvement in movement symptoms for people who had taken the caffeine capsules compared to those who took the placebo capsules. There was also no difference in quality of life. Because of the findings showing no benefit from taking caffeine, the study was stopped.

Dr Postuma added: "While our previous study showed possible improvement in symptoms, that study was shorter, so it's possible that caffeine may have a shortterm benefit that quickly dissipates.

"Regardless, our core finding is that caffeine cannot be recommended as therapy for movement symptoms of Parkinson's disease."

Dr Charles Hall, of Albert Einstein College of Medicine who wrote a commentary on the study for Neurology, said: "It is important that promising leads be studied.

"It is also important that the disappointing findings like these be shared so new research can focus on other possible treatments instead."

BABIES ARE AT TWICE THE RISK OF HAVING SEVERE FLU ... if they have an older sibling, study finds

Children can easily pass viruses onto their younger siblings, researchers said Flu can be life-threat-

ening in youngsters because it can cause lung infections

Almost half of all cases of severe flu in babies are caught from older siblings

Experts said the findings showed the importance of getting children vaccinated

BABIES are at twice the risk of suffering severe flu if they have an older brother or sister, a study

Children are 'effective spreaders' and can easily pass viruses onto their vulnerable younger siblings, researchers

Flu can be life-threatening in young children because it can cause lung infections, breathing difficulties and high fever, which can lead to fits.

Between three per cent and 11 per cent of babies and toddlers in developed countries acquire flu-associated illnesses each year, placing a heavy burden on health services.

Almost half of all cases of severe flu in babies under six months old are caught from older siblings, according to a study by University College London's Great Ormond Institute of Child Health. Children are 'effective spreaders' and can easily pass viruses onto their vulnerable younger siblings, University College London researchers said.

Experts warned parents the findings showed the importance of getting older children vaccinated to protect babies in the family - who usually are not given a flu vaccine before the age of two.

Lead researcher Dr Pia Hardelid said, "Flu can be a serious infection in very young children but at the moment there is no vaccine approved for babies under six months. This means we need to look at other ways to minimise the risk of infection."

For those with two or more older siblings, the risk tripled.

There was around one extra hospital admission for every thousand children who had one older sibling. In those with two older siblings, there were two extra admissions per children.

Babies born between July and December - who would be young and vulnerable at the start of the flu season - were also at higher risk.

Nasal spray vaccines

Since 2013, nasal spray flu vaccines have been given to children aged between two and nine on the NHS. Some areas are rolling out the vaccine to all primary school-age chil-

It is also offered to those aged up to 17 and from six months to two years who are considered high risk because of existing chronic health problems.

The importance of the flu jab Dr Hardelid added: "Our study suggests that older siblings pose a risk of serious infection for their baby sis-

ters and brothers. "The nasal spray vaccine, which is now being offered in GP surgeries and primary schools in the UK, provides a good opportunity to protect the children who receive it, as well as their younger siblings.

"There is not much parents can do about the time of year their baby is born, but women can also help reduce

The researchers said vaccinating the risk of serious flu for their newolder children could have a protec- borns by taking up the invitation to when they are still pregnant.

"There is some evidence that maternal vaccination during pregnancy can protect young babies from flu infection."

Rates of hospital admission were also higher for children aged six to 23 months with older siblings, but the association for this age group was much weaker.

Further research will test whether the introduction of the vaccine for children aged two and older can help reduce cases of flu among under-

SSA CELEBRATES GOLDEN JUBILEE

SUGAR PRODUCTION START AT ONLY 5 600 TONS PER ANNU

THOUGH the sugarcane sector now produces over 700 000 metric tons (MT) of sugar, over 230 000 MT of molasses and generates revenues in excess of E4 billion, it only started with a single irrigated scheme and mill, with output only amounting to 5 600 tons.

On Wednesday evening, hundreds of stakeholders including growers, millers, financers, investors and government gathered to reflect on the growth of the industry in the past 50 years during the commemoration of the Swaziland Sugar Association (SSA) golden jubilee.


The commemoration was also graced by representatives of the SSA long standing customers Czamikov from the United Kingdom, the South African Sugar Association (SASA), ACP/LDC London Sugar Industries and the Association of Mozambique Sugar Producers (APAMO) amongst others.

Speaking during the function, Prime Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini applauded the SSA for playing a significant role in shaping the industry for five decades.

SSA sells sugar produced in the country. It is also responsible for establishing policy, general development and the regulation of the industry.

Dlamini said not only has the sector created substantial employment opportunities, especially at smallholder level, but it has also been ranked as high as third in international assessment of cost competitiveness

"This undoubtedly reflects the strong partnership between growers and millers, that has been essential to the success of the sector, sup-

ported by the regulation work of SSA and complemented by the Sugar Industry Agreement which is the mechanism that guides the relationship between millers and growers," he said.

Dlamini said the success of this model 50 years on was illustrated by the continued growth of the sector despite recurring challenges.

In the duration of the past 50 years, the industry survived serious challenges such as the 1984 tropical storm Domonia, the droughts of 1991 to 1994 and 2015 to 2016 and the changing international market landscape.

Currently, sugarcane growing makes up nearly 70 per cent of the country's total agricultural output. One third of agricultural workers

are in sugarcane growing and sugar milling output makes up 25 per cent of total manufacturing output and contributes 10 per cent to gross domestic product (GDP).

SSA Chief Executive Officer Phil Mnisi said 50 years was indeed a milestone that was monumental not to just SSA and the sugar industry, but to the Kingdom as a whole, especially on the eve of its own golden jubilee celebration next year.

"We are already looking ahead at ensuring that the sugar sector's legacy remains for generations to come. We are considering short, medium and long-term sustainability solutions, particularly around drought recovery which impacted immensely in our industry in the past three years," he said.

He thanked the relentless support of government towards growing the sector.

Tibiyo TakaNgwane Managing Director Dr. Absalom Dlamini commended the roles played by different stakeholders within and outside the sector to keep the industry going over these years.

"SSA has been and continues to be a pivotal partner and industry maker, ensuring that the sector remains professional, profitable and that Swaziland remains an attractive investment partner," he

SSA President Oswald Magwenzi attributed the success of SSA to the good leadership of the organisation and the enabling environment created by government.

"SSA has also thrived due to the strong partnership of millers and growers and cooperative partners, especially the European Union (EU)," he said.

Summary of sugarcane sector early developments

In 1957 Ubombo Ranches (PTY) LTD planted the first commercial sugarcane crop which was processed in a small second hand mill at Big Bend.

In 1960 Ubombo completed a large new mill at the present site and early production in the Big Bend mill amounted to 5 600 tons.

In 1960, a second mill was built at Mhlume and sugar production increased to 100 000 tons per annum.

SSA was established through the Sugar Act of 1967

In 1980, a third sugar mill was commissioned at Simunye and production increased to 471 000 tons per annum.

Speaking during the commemoration of the Swaziland Sugar Association (SSA) golden jubilee held on Wednesday, Tibiyo TakaNgwane Managing Director Dr. Absalom Dlamini said this was one of the most remarkable accomplishments in the sector in the past 50 years.

He said the benefits have spilled over to indirect beneficiaries including spouses, children, parents and relatives of the people employed in the value chain.

Also, Dlamini said the sugar industry has made inroads in building capacity for many Swazis to take up highly specialised positions in the sector, including at leadership and other decision making levels.

"Current estimates suggest that less than two per cent expatriates constitute the total workforce," he said.

IT'S HIGH TIME WE ADDRESS TAX ISSUES - MP MARWICK

FOLLOWING the cluster of challenges faced by businesses, amongst which tax and regulatory frameworks were said to be the thorniest issues, Lobamba Lomdzala Member of Parliament Marwick Khumalo says its high time legislators address these challenges.

Khumalo was responding following the presentation of the company survey 2017 findings on Wednesday by the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) and the ministry of economic planning and development.

During the presentation of the findings, CBS Senior Economist, Balance of Payments Sipho Sikhosana said most companies cited regulatory, tax issues and utility costs as their main challenges.

Khumalo said they have been hammering on tax issues for years.

"Now, the survey has confirmed the concerns of the general populace of the country. The challenge comes back to us as legislators and show that there are some amendments that need to be done," said Khumalo.

Unpack

He further invited the presenters to engage with legislators to unpack the specific areas of concerns for business-

"The Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) also has to be mindful of the fact that there are serious concerns on taxes," he said.

During his presentation, Sikhosana said the manufacturing sector, which is the most contributing sector to gross domestic product (GDP) took 24 per cent share of the challenges recorded in 2016.

The survey findings reflect that companies in the manufacturing sector were highly concerned with the high costs of utilities, especially the escalating electricity prices and the unreliable supply.

"Problems around taxes and border issues have, in 2016, been prevalent in the discussions as companies complained around issues related to late payments

of refunds and a delay at the border that often times affect their turnaround time," said the report.

Poor communications infrastructure was seen as a barrier to the growth of the manufacturing sector with slow internet connectivity reportedly being a great concern for businesses as paper work for border clearances is now submitted online.

The report states that about 43 per cent of the challenges reported regulatory frameworks were linked to the financial

Unfair competition

"Non-banking financial institutions are said to pose unfair competition to the banking industry as they compete for the same pie but have a different set of regulations," said the report.

Manufacturing companies reported being burdened with data requests by regulators.

On the other hand, the report said other sectors such as the wholesale and retail sector complained about the lack of regulation in the industry which also brings unfair competition.

On issues related with tax, the report stated that businesses felt that taxes have increased the cost of doing business.

As a consequence, the report said one company even had to reallocate one of its shops to South Africa as it has became very difficult and time consuming to export without having a sister compa-

The prevalent challenge recorded by the manufacturing and tourism sectors was high costs.

The report said accommodation establishments raised the issue of huge increases in other deposit charges following the scrapping of bank charges raising the cost of doing business in the country. "Costs are also exacerbated by the increasing number of regulatory authorities or institutions as they also impose levies from companies to finance their operations," said the report.

Whereas, increases in interest rates during the past year were also said to have negatively affected the banking sector.

"It has affected the affordability of debt, particularly mortgage and it is evident by the sudden increase in the sale of houses as the mortgage becomes unaffordable," said the report.

About 21 per cent of the challenges reported by companies, representing all sectors of the economy, were related to government inefficiencies.

Interestingly, about 28 per cent of these challenges were raised by marketing

The survey results show that 35 per cent of the opportunities are focused towards expansion of businesses.



Create a 'special jail' for the corrupt, - Makhura

JOHANNESBURG - Gauteng Premier David Makhura says those implicated in state capture should be thrown into a "special jail".

"Two weeks ago, I visited Brazil. It has a special prison for all those who are corrupt. We must build one similar prison."

Makhura was addressing thousands of COSATU and SACP members who marched on his office on Wednesday against state capture.

But while the address by Makhura, who is also Deputy Chairperson of the ANC in Gauteng, resonated with the crowd, he omitted to reveal the possible candidates for that prison.

"I am not captured. They tried and I refused to be captured."

Without mentioning the Gupta family by name, Makhura told the cheering crowd that a failed attempt had been made on him and members of his government.

In an apparent endorsement of the COSATU and SACP campaign, Makhura said "state capture warranted the attention of us as leadership of government and alliance partners". He said everyone in government had to deal with cor-

ruption and overcome it. While Makhura was given 14 days to respond to the demands, he assured the marchers that their copy of demands was going to reach the office of President Jacob Zuma before noon on Wednesday. *The Star*

DA wants Zuma to appoint SABC board immediately

CAPE TOWN – The DA has called on President Jacob Zuma to appoint the SABC board immediately.

This after the interim board's term expired on Tuesday, without Zuma bothering to appoint the board recommended to him by Parliament three weeks ago.

In a statement from the presidency on Tuesday, it said Zuma was "still applying his mind".

DA MP Phumzile van Damme said in a statement released on Wednesday the work of the permanent board is especially important in the wake of the SABC's annual report for the 2016/17 financial year. "The report paints a grim picture about the state of the SABC's financial affairs," said Van Damme.

"The SABC's contingent liabilities currently stand at R956.7m, which the report flags as a major risk to the broadcaster. This is due to the corporation currently being embroiled in a number of lawsuits.

This exorbitant amount could potentially cripple the already ailing SABC," she said. Van Damme is also concerned about: - Recorded losses of R997m after taxes;

- Fruitless and wasteful expenditure of R145.99m;

- Irregular expenditure of R4.4bn, of which R514.95m was due to procurement policies not being followed;

- Hlaudi Motsoeneng's bonus - R11.5m for 2016/17 financial year; and total director and key personnel's compensation - R79.71m.

"Thus, there cannot be any delays. President Zuma must appoint the board immediately to ensure that they get to work on restoring the SABC back to the world-class broadcaster it once was," said Van Damme. Van Damme also wants the SABC and Communications Minister Ayanda Dlodlo to engage Parliament on the SABC's financial recovery.

Heavy jail term for convicted baby sellers

DURBAN - They sold a six-monthold baby boy for R2 500 and an air conditioner which they pawned for R600.

But now two women - who posed as a caring "teacher" and "social worker" - will spend an effective 20 years and 10 years respectively behind bars after being convicted of human trafficking laws, kidnapping, corruption and moneylaundering. In spite of their pleas of innocence, Tazley Msweli and Sibongile Ndimande, who both live in the Pinetown area, were convicted of all charges by Pinetown Regional Court Magistrate KQ

Hadebe and were sentenced this week.

The biological mother of the child, who lives in Durban's Point area, testified that she had met Msweli at hospital where she had taken her baby because he was sick.

She said she had "poured out her heart" to Msweli about her dire financial situation. While Msweli claimed the mother contacted her some time later and asked for her help in finding a home for the child, the mother denied this, telling the court: "Even though I was poor I would not give up my child."

Evidence was that Msweli was

the mastermind and charmed Ndimande into getting involved in the money-making scam.

They went round to the mother's house, posing as a teacher and social worker and made promises that they could assist in getting groceries for her. They persuaded her to go to town to do shopping. When she went inside to buy the groceries, they offered to hold the baby.

When she came out five minutes later they had disappeared with the child. The "adoptive" mother, who cared for the baby for six months before being caught, managed to raise R2 500 as an "administration"

fee" and offered them the air conditioning unit to make up the balance. She said she presumed the baby had been abandoned but conceded that proper adoption procedures had not been followed.

She too was arrested and pleaded guilty in 2016 before another magistrate. She received a sentence of correctional supervision and a fine. When she testified at Msweli and Ndimande's trial, she spoke of how she could not have her own child, was desperate for one, and how she got to love the baby. 'Whites only' job ad removed after 20 days

CAPE TOWN - An advert specifying that "only white candidates" should apply for a digital design position in the Western Cape was removed from a local recruitment website on Wednesday afternoon - more than 20 days after it was posted. People Solved, based in Cape Town, posted the advert on September 5 at the behest of one of its clients.

No deadline for applications was provided in the advertisement which called for applicants for an intermediate to senior user experience (UX) design post.

The package was estimated at R420 000 per annum. "Please note. Only white candidates," the advert read. It did not specify the name of the company seeking to fill the position.

It was also not known how many applications the advert had since garnered.

People Solved Director Simon Hill said the advert was removed as soon as News24 had alerted them to the "mistake".

"We are investigating the incident and as you've seen, immediately removed the advert when we noticed it," Hill said.

"I can tell you this is the first of its kind that something like this happens."

Hill said a junior employee posted the advert without checking the content.

Companies send the information about vacancies to administrative officers who then process it and post it onto the website, Hill said.

"I can assure you that we do not accept anything like this."

Hill did not want to disclose the name of the relevant company,

"We will be talking to the company and possibly reviewing if we still want to work with them [in future]," he said. *AFP*

Deputy speaker among thousands protesting state capture

CAPE TOWN - Deputy National Assembly Speaker Lechesa Tsenoli's presence loomed large during Wednesday's nationwide marches against state capture, as the senior alliance leader vowed that he could no longer remain silent on the matter.

Parliament is investigating allegations of state capture against the controversial Gupta family, who have been accused of using their friendship with President Jacob Zuma to loot the state coffers.







TRIPOLI - Libya's navy warned it will seize activists' boats on migrant rescue missions that enter its waters unauthorised, after a run-in on Wednesday with a German vessel during which a warning shot was fired."This time we avoided an escalation. In future, we will seize the boats of NGOs that do not respect Libya's sovereignty," said navy spokesman General Ayub Kacem.The Libyan coastguard earlier boarded a boat operated by Germany's "Mission Lifeline" which had picked up 52 migrants at sea." Reuters

More than 10 dead in floods

KAMPALA – Rainstorms in western Uganda caused flooding that swamped houses, killing at least 13 people including two babies, police said. Rubanda district police commander Ramathan Tai said officers in the rural town of Nfasha recovered seven bodies during a heavy rainstorm on Tuesday night and found six more the following day. "There are reports of some people missing, but we are yet to establish the number as some homes were washed away during the rainstorm," Tai said. AFP

Options to ease migrant pressure

ROME - Italy has turned to its homegrown African entrepreneurs for help in easing the economic pressures driving hundreds of thousands of migrants onto the country's southern shores. In a small initiative billed as symbolically significant, Rome's foreign ministry this week unveiled a programme under which business people with African roots are offered financing to pursue jobcreating projects in their countries of origin. AFP

Hundreds seek sanctuary

ACCRA - Hundreds of Togolese nationals

have fled to neighbouring Ghana to escape reprisals after a wave of anti-government protests, a Ghanaian official said. Paddy Tetteh, from the Ghana Refugee Board, said the first batch



arrived last Wednesday and although numbers had since fallen, more were still trying to come in. "They are close to 300," he told AFP. Most were in the northern district of Chereponi, close to Ghana's eastern border, he added. Chereponi chief executive Abdul Razak Tahiru told reporters that food, mats, bedding and mosquito nets had been distributed to the refugees." AFP

AU laments US travel ban

ADDIS ABABA - The African Union on Wednesday expressed its "bewilderment" at US President Donald Trump's inclusion of Chad on an updated and open-ended travel ban list issued at the weekend. In a statement the AU said it had been "perplexed" by the presence of three African countries - Libya, Somalia and Sudan - on Trump's original travel ban, and welcomed the removal of Sudan from the new list, issued on Sunday. But it criticised the "unjust" inclusion of Chad, a country with a long history of cooperation with the United States on counter-terrorism. AFP

Algeria plans to introduce wealth tax

ALGIERS – Algeria will implement a wealth tax for the first time next year as part of measures aimed at securing new sources of finance after a sharp fall in energy earnings, Prime Minister Ahmed Ouyahia said on Wednesday.

State finances of the OPEC member North African nation have been significantly hit after a more than 50 per cent drop in oil and gas revenue.

Oil and gas account for 60 per cent of the state budget and 95 per cent of total exports.

That has forced the government to consider long-delayed reforms, including turning to Islamic financial services and developing the country's stock market, which now has a low level of liquidity.

Authorities have also started

reducing public spending and have set import restrictions in a bid to cut the value of goods shipped from abroad.

· Ouyahia said the implementation of the wealth tax from

early 2018 would affect about 10 per cent of the country's 41 million people.

"This tax will not concern 90 per cent of Algerians," he told Parliament. *Reuters*

HARARE - President Robert Mugabe's government has behaved in an "irresponsible" way in the face of a growing economic crisis, and the fears of Zimbabwe's citizens are "legitimate", a leading association of churches said Wednesday. In a strongly-worded statement, the Zimbabwe Council of Churches (ZCC) said the govern-

In a strongly-worded statement, the Zimbabwe Council of Churches (ZCC) said the government had lost the trust of citizens and should urgently try to regain it.

'behaving irresponsibly'

"Zimbabweans have lost trust that the government is sincere in addressing national problems when they see the government officials choosing to send their children to foreign schools and being treated in foreign hospitals," it said.

The latest crisis in Zimbabwe emerged over the weekend, when fuel queues resurfaced and panic buying of basic commodities gripped some stores.

It came as fears abound that the country is facing a repeat of the 2007-2008 crisis that saw empty store shelves and fuel stations on the back of foreign currency shortages.

The ZCC, which groups 26 different denominations, said the fears of citizens were legitimate

"In a situation where there are winding queues at the fuel stations, it is irresponsible for any government official to insinuate that all is well in our nation," the statement says. *News24*

Genocide talk 'not justified'

GENEVA - The president of the Central African Republic pushed back on Wednesday against the UN warnings of looming genocide in his country, saying the complex crisis could not be reduced to religious and ethnic strife.

"We think that to talk about genocide at this stage is going too far... it is not justified," President Faustin-Archange Touadera told reporters in Geneva after addressing the Human Rights Council.

He was asked about comments from the recently departed United Nations humanitarian chief, Stephen O'Brien, who said renewed clashes in the country had "the early warnings signs of genocide".

Touadera countered that the factors fuelling the violence varied significantly in different places, with cases where people were fighting members of their own ethnic group or even their own family.

The conflict is partly driven by competition for land and resources like diamonds and timber, among other factors, the president said.

UGANDA TO SCRAP PRESIDENTIAL AGE LIMIT

KAMPALA - Uganda's Parliament on Wednesday took the first step towards scrapping the presidential age limit that would allow long-standing ruler Yoweri Museveni to stay in power.

Tempers flared for a second day over a plan, backed by members of President Museveni's National Resistance Movement (NRM) party, to table a constitutional amendment doing away with age limits, allowing the 73-year-old to run for a sixth consecutive term in 2021.

MPs brandished microphone stands, threw punches and clambered over benches as security officers sought to remove 25 law-makers barred by Speaker Rebecca Kadaga after engaging in another brawl on the same issue the day before.

Despite the disruption, Raphael Magyezi's motion seeking to introduce a private member's Bill proposing the removal of age limits was passed with an overwhelming cry of "Aye!" from government MPs after leader of the parliamentary opposition, Winnie Kiiza of the Forum for Democratic Change (FDC), led a walk-out.

"We are not going to be part of Museveni's life presidency project," Kiiza said.

Supporters of the motion argued that age limits discriminate against the elderly.

"Age should not be a factor that hinders the rights and freedom of any Ugandan to vie for the post of a president," said Moses Balyeku.

Three-year-old takes reign as new 'living goddess' in Nepal

KATHMANDU - A three-year-old girl has been named the new Kumari of Nepal's capital Kathmandu after her predecessor retired when she reached puberty, continuing an ancient tradition that sees young girls worshipped as "living goddesses".

Trishna Shakya was anointed as the new Kumari in a ceremony yesterday, when she will be taken from her family home to live in a palace in Kathmandu's ancient Durbar Square where she will be cared for by specially appointed caretakers. She was selected from among four candidates, Uddhav Man Karmacharya, a Hindu priest who attends to the Kumari, told AFP on Tuesday.

"She will take her place on the Kumari's throne after we perform prayers and tantric rituals," Karmacharya said.

Once she is anointed a living goddess, Shakya, who, like her predecessors, belongs to the Newar community indigenous to the Kathmandu valley, will only be allowed to leave her new home 13 times a year on special feast days.

She will be paraded through Kathmandu in ceremonial dress and elaborate makeup to be worshipped. AFP

Zuckerberg fires back at Trump over Facebook barb

SAN FRANCISCO - Facebook chief Mark Zuckerberg fired back at US President Donald Trump on Wednesday after he accused the leading social network of being "always anti-Trump".

Zuckerberg rejected the notion, countering that Facebook is working to ensure "free and fair elections" with an online platform that does not favour one side over another.

Zuckerberg's post at Facebook came after Trump accused the social network of bias in a morning tweet that read:

"Facebook was always anti-Trump. The Networks were always anti-Trump hence, Fake News, @nytimes(apologised) & @WaPo were anti-Trump, Collusion?"

Early morning Twitter tizzies have become a hallmark of Trump's presidency.

"Trump says Facebook is against him. Liberals say we helped Trump," Zuckerberg said in his post.

Both sides are upset about ideas and content they don't like. That's what running a platform for all ideas looks like."AFP

ISTANBUL - Russian President Vladimir Putin yesterday met his Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan for talks on Syria and a key weapons deal, hoping to strengthen an increasingly active relationship that has troubled the West.

Despite a regional rivalry that goes back to the Ottoman Empire and the Romanov dynasty, Russia and Turkey have been working closely since a 2016 reconciliation ended a crisis caused by the shooting down of a Russian war plane over Syria.

"Russia and Turkey are cooperating very tightly," Putin's spokesperson Dmitry Peskov said ahead of the one-day working visit by Putin to Ankara.

Both Moscow and Ankara are pushing for the creation of four "de-escalation zones" in Syria to end the civil war that has raged since 2011.


Meanwhile, Turkey, a NATO

member, has signed a deal reportedly worth \$2bn to buy S-400 air defence systems from Russia, a move that has shocked its allies in the alliance.

But while Putin and Erdogan are at pains to project an increasingly productive relationship, a shadow could be cast by Monday's independence referendum in Iraqi Kurdistan, which enraged Ankara, but which Moscow stopped short of condemning.

Turkey and Russia have been on opposing sides during the more than six years of war in Syria, with Russia the key backer of President Bashar Assad and Turkey supporting rebels seeking his ouster.

Trump's business tax cut seen as major boon for top 1%

WASHINGTON - Despite rhetoric." statement this month that "the rich will not be gaining at all," the tax plan that the White House and Republican leaders rolled out may contain more than \$1 trillion in breaks for the highest earners and the wealthy - at least without revenue offsets that remain largely unspecified.

"This is a huge tax cut for the top one per cent," Leonard Burman, Director of the Urban-Brookings Tax Policy Centre, said on Wednesday after details of the plan emerged. "Impossible to square with the president's esterness of exercises

The tax framework sets up some suspense over where Congress will set the top individual income-tax rate - giving lawmakers flexibility to set it higher than the 35% mentioned in the document.

But another provision, which would slash the rate paid by owners of partnerships and limited-liability companies, is seen as a potential bonanza for people at the top of the income scale. The framework calls for capping the tax rate on such pass-through businesses at 25%. Businesses organised that way don't pay income tax them-

selves, instead passing earnings to their owners, wno pay at their individual rates. Owners with high business incomes, who currently face a top rate of 39.6%, are in for major tax relief, policy analysts said.

In describing the newly proposed tax rate, the framework cites its impact on "small and family-owned businesses," but pass-through entities range from mom-and-pop grocers to major, closely held businesses, including Trump's companies.

The tax plan is "not good for me,",Trump said on Wednesday during a speech in Indianapolis to rally support. news24

Abe dissolves lower house

TOKYO - Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe dissolved the lower house of Parliament yesterday, paving the way for a snap election that is expected to be held on October 22. The speaker of the house, Tadamori Oshima, read the statement of dissolution. Abe is widely seen as trying to reconsolidate his grip on power within the ruling Liberal-Democratic Party, so he can extend the term of his premiership next year. The dissolution of the more powerful of Japan's two-chamber Parliament comes more than a year before required by law. AP

Island evacuation order

WELLINGTON - Vanuatu officials yesterday ordered the complete evacuation of an island in the Pacific archipelago where a rumbling, belching volcano is threatening to blow.

Government spokesperson Hilaire Bule said ministers decided they couldn't risk people's lives and so ordered the compulsory evacuation of Ambae island, which is home to about 11 000 people. Island resident Lilian Garae said she could see "smoke coming out from the hills" and hear regular booming noises from the Manaro volcano.

80% landmines dismantled

LA PAZ, BOLIVIA - Chile has dug up and dismantled 80 per cent of the landmines

planted along its border with Bolivia, belatedly complying with a landmark international treaty, Bolivia's defence minister said. The mines, a relic of the 1970s when Chile planted landmines along



its borders under the dictatorship of Augusto Pinochet, have long been a source of tension with Bolivia. "The report is that (the Chilean military) have already dismantled 80 per cent of the mines." AFP

Fishy rain falls over Mexico

Mexico City - Civil defence officials in northeast Mexico say a light rain was accompanied by small fish that fell from the sky. Tamaulipas civil defence said in a brief statement that rain in the coastal city of Tampico included fish. Photos posted on the agency's Facebook page show four small fish in a bag and another on a sidewalk. According the US Library of Congress, it's a phenomenon that has been reported since ancient times. AP

Child shoots himself

ST LOUIS#A four-year-old boy is in critical condition in a hospital in the American state of Missouri after shooting himself in the mouth. The shooting happened in north St Louis. The child was also struck in the hand by the same bullet. The child's name has not been released and police have not disclosed whose gun he had or how he got it. The shooting was the second in four days involving a young child in St Louis. A twoyear-old accidentally shot and killed his father.

PARIS - Kylian Mbappe was singled out for praise despite being the only member of Paris Saint-Germain's superstar attack who didn't score in Wednesday's big Champions League win over German giants Bayern Munich.

Dani Alves, Edinson Cavani and Neymar netted as PSG eased to a 3-0 victory at Parc des Princes to make it two wins from two games in Group B and take a huge step towards progressing to the last 16.

But Mbappe, with his frightening pace and skill, set up Cavani's magnificent strike that made it 2-0 and left David Alaba for dead as he created Neymar's goal in the second half.

"Kylian is progressing well. He has great talent and great desire to help the team grow," said coach Unai Emery of the 18-year-old, who got the biggest roar of the night from the 45 000 home fans in the French capital when he made way for Angel di Maria late on.

"The idea when we signed him was that he would help the team grow and the team would help him grow too. His was a complete performance."

The French teenager was making just his second appearance at Parc des Princes since arriving from Monaco on an initial loan deal that will become permanent next year, for a fee rising to €180 million with bonuses.

Potentially

Only Neymar, at €222 million, will have cost more in the history of football and along with Cavani, PSG look to have a potentially Champions League-winning strike force.

But they will need to remain in this form and avoid the kind of tensions that marred the recent win over Lyon, when Cavani and Neymar argued over who should take a penalty.

"The expectations on us were big, which is normal after the transfer window," Mbappe told Canal Plus. "It's just the beginning. We wanted to put in a big performance against a great team and we did it."

The 'MCN' attack have now scored 18 goals between them this season and they have also made PSG more adaptable, able to transform into a side that soaks up pressure before destroying opponents on the break.

"Normally we control games with possession against deep-lying defences. Today they defended higher and had the ball but we controlled the game without it," said Emery, whose side have scored eight goals and conceded none in

two European outings.

In the Champions League we must never think we are the best because we are not. There are lots of strong sides, and Bayern came here to impose themselves," said midfielder Marco Verratti.

ANTONIO CONTE LAMENTS TIGHT TURNAROUND FOR CITY CLASH

LONDON - Chelsea boss Antonio Conte blasted Premier League schedulers over his side's short turnaround from Champions League action before facing highflying Manchester City in a topof-the-table clash tomorrow.

Conte's men put in a brilliant performance to inflict only Atletico Madrid's second Champions League defeat on home soil in 24 games on Wednesday, when Michy Batshuayi's 93rd-minute winner sealed a 2-1 victory.

However, the Italian lamented the advantage handed to City, who played their Champions League fixture at home to Shakhtar Donetsk 24 hours earlier on Tuesday.

"I think we are a bit penalised and in this case, it is very important to analyse, before taking these decisions, the different situations of the team," said Conte.

"City played yesterday at home. We played tonight away and we will return to London around four o'clock (in the morning)."

City lead the Premier League from Manchester United on goal difference, with Chelsea three points back in third.

"Man City is a really strong team. They are scoring a lot of goals, they are in a good moment of form and we have to prepare well (for) this game because it is very important.

"Before taking this decision someone must analyse very well this situation.

"There is the international break (after this weekend). My surprise is for this because there is the time (to play the game later)."

Conte was far more content with Chelsea's display as they battled back to claim a well-deserved three points despite falling behind to Antoine Griezmann's penalty five minutes before halftime.

Former Real Madrid striker Alvaro Morata stretched his scoring streak



to seven goals in as many games with a deft near-post header from the outstanding Eden Hazard's cross to level on the hour mark.

Morata and Cesc Fabregas then passed up huge chances before Batshuayi struck the decisive blow with the last kick of the game after a patient team move tore a tiring Atletico to shreds.

"It is very difficult when Atletico Madrid score to come back, but despite this we deserved to win because we continued to play with good personality," added Conte.

FA charges West Ham, Spurs after ugly melee

LONDON - The Football Association on Wednesday charged West Ham and Tottenham Hotspur for failing to control their players during their Premier League clash at the weekend.

Spurs won Saturday's derby at the London Stadium 3-2 but almost squandered a three-goal lead.

The Hammers were pressing for an equaliser in stoppage time when tempers frayed.

"West Ham United and Tottenham Hotspur have been charged by the FA following their fixture on Saturday," a statement from the FA said.

"It is alleged that in or around the 95th minute of the game, both clubs failed to ensure their players conducted themselves in an orderly fashion. They have until 6:00 pm on September 28, 2017 to respond to the charge."

Five players were cautioned by referee Michael Oliver in stoppage time.

West Ham's Andy Carroll, Winston Reid and Andre Ayew were shown yellow cards, while Eric Dier and Fernando Llorente were booked for Spurs.

The incident that prompted the charge came after a foul by Carroll, which drew angry reactions from both sides and saw four players booked. Ayew's caution for a foul came earlier in stoppage time.

Spurs were under pressure after being reduced to 10 men with 20 minutes remaining when Serge Aurier received a second yellow card.

Kane is Tottenham's answer to Ronaldo, Messi

LONDON-Hugo Lloris believes Tottenham now boast their own superstar in Harry Kane just as Real Madrid have Cristiano Ronaldo and Barcelona have Lionel Messi.

Kane's first Champions League hat-trick against Apoel Nicosia on Tuesday secured Spurs a 3-0 victory and underlined the 24year-old's status as one of the deadliest strikers in the world.

This year, Kane has 34 goals in 30 club appearances, including six hat-tricks. That is more trebles than Messi and Ronaldo combined, with the La Liga pair owning two each.

The England forward is also the top scorer in this season's Champions League, his earlier double against Borussia Dortmund giving him five goals overall, ahead of Ronaldo's four and Messi's two.

Lloris said: "In every big team you have a big goalscorer. In Tottenham it is Harry Kane.

"I think for him he has got a lot of things to prove in the Champions League. He shows his quality and skills at the moment.

"Five goals in two games is fantastic and hopefully he will carry on in the same way for him and the team. We are not surprised about Harry, we know his talent, his skills, his aptitude to score goals and important goals.

"He is our main player, like in top teams, in Real Madrid you have Ronaldo, in Barca you have Messi." Kane is unlikely ever to get close to either Ronaldo or Messi's glittering career records but excitement is growing around his potential for both Spurs and England, with a World Cup in Russia approaching next sum-

Lloris, who captained France for their home tournament at Euro 2016, insists Kane can handle the pressure. "Give him time. The most important thing is he is exigent towards himself. Then, for sure, he will lead the national team, he will lead Tottenham," Lloris said. "Ronaldo and Messi - they are from another galaxy but Harry has got so much potential to become one of the best. I am not worried, he is connected with the world, he is very calm, he is a hard worker and he is very ambitious". Daily Mail

Vardy omitted from England squad

LONDON - Gareth Southgate has left Jamie Vardy out of the England squad to face Slovenia and Lithuania in the final two World Cup qualifiers.

It is reported that the Foxes hitman, who has scored five times in six Premier League outings this season, may have been omitted due to a hip injury.

Southgate has entrusted both Daniel Sturridge and Jermain Defoe, who have two goals between them this season, to vie for places with the in-form Harry Kane and Marcus Rashford up top.

Meanwhile there is a recall to the national squad for Manchester City midfielder Fabian Delph.

The City star, who has just 223 minutes of football under his belt this term, last played for the Three Lions in the 2-0 defeat by Spain in November 2015.

However, his wonder-strike against Crystal Palace last weekend will have done his chances of selection no harm at all.

Man City confirm Mendy's injury

LONDON - Manchester City have confirmed that new £52million signing Benjamin Mendy has ruptured the cruciate ligament in his right knee.

Mendy will have surgery in Barcelona today and faces a battle to play again this season, delivering a serious blow to City's plans. The France left-back suffered the injury against Crystal Palace last weekend in what was only his fifth appearance for City since moving from Monaco in the summer.

Mendy was sent to Spain to be assessed by specialist surgeon Dr Ramon Cugat and scans yesterday confirmed the serious ligament damage. A statement from the club read: 'Manchester City can confirm that Benjamin Mendy has ruptured the anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee. "After initial tests in Manchester at the start of the week, Benjamin travelled to Barcelona to see a specialist doctor, where further examinations of the knee today confirmed the extent of the injury. "Benjamin will undergo surgery tomorrow in Barcelona, and everyone at the club wishes him a speedy recovery." Guardiola hinted at the severity of the injury after Tuesday's win over Shakhtar Donetsk when he compared Mendy's injury to that of Ilkay Gundogan who did not play for nine months after rupturing his ACL last season. The City boss also did not rule out buying a new left-back in the January transfer window after being linked with Southampton's Ryan Bertrand over the summer. The player himself tweeted after the news was confirmed, saying he was joining 'Injury FC' on loan but vowed to come back stronger. Daily Mail

In the wake of the Reds' 1-1 draw at Spartak Moscow in their Champions League group game clash, Coutinho has re-affirmed his commitment to the club. "I'm calm. It's all passed by," he said. "I'm here to defend the colours, to give my maximum." On the result at the Otkrytiye Arena, which leaves the Reds still winless in Group E, Coutinho was keen to stress the positives. Daily Mail

CARLO ANCELOTTI 'SACKED' AS BAYERN MUNICH MANAGER

MUNICH - Carlo Ancelotti has left Bayern Munich after just over a year in charge following their 3-0 Champions League defeat at the hands of Paris St Germain, according to reports in Germany.

Bayern, German champions last season under Ancelotti and for each of the last five seasons, have had a mixed start to the campaign. They suffered a 2-0 defeat to Hoffenheim before drawing 2-2 at home to Wolfsburg in the league, having been two goals ahead. Ancelotti's assistant Willy Sagnol will take over on a temporary basis, with former Borussia Dortmund boss Thomas Tuchel

likely to be at the head of the queue to replace the Italian full-time.

Chief Executive Karl-Heinz Rummenigge has previously discussed the mutual admiration between himself and Tuchel, while there is a desire to see a German manager take control at Bayern again for the first time since Jupp Heynckes' reign, which ended in 2013. At a team dinner following the PSG loss, Rummenigge blasted the squad, saying: "What we saw today was not Bayern Munich. I think we can all agree on that. Looking at your faces, I don't think there's anyone who has not understood that." Former Real Madrid

and Chelsea manager Ancelotti took charge of Bayern in July 2016 following Pep Guardiola's departure to Manchester City. He continued Bayern's domination of the Bundesliga, winning the league by 15 points from second placed RB Leipzig.






Scramble

We would also like to appeal to the teams' spokespersons to communicate with their supporters the sitting arrangement to avoid unnecessary violence on the stands. Supporters also need to be informed that teams can charge up to E40 for some double headers and it is the responsibility of the teams to



educate the supporters," he said.

Vilakati said another issue was that of cars entering the stadium on the day.

"Teams are allowed only six cars, includ-

ing the one transporting the players. We appeal for respect even when it comes to the sitting arrangement at the stadium, including the royal box," he said.
