

DPM packs all his bags, leaves state house empty

DEPUTY Prime Minister Paul Diamini has moved out of the house government rented for him in the past five

"My time in that house has elapsed. It was a temporary arrangement for a certain period of time and that period has come to an end," he said.

The DPM said he now lives in Manzini. He and all other parliamentarians are approaching the end of their five-year term and are currently waiting for His the 10th Parliament in preparation for the elections.

The DPM, for the duration of his soon to end political term, lived in a house rented by the state at Thembelihle.

Move

This was after he refused to move into a house formerly occupied by his predecessor Themba Masuku at Waterford

The residence that Dlamini refused to move into was one designated by government for incumbent deputy prime

Interviewed in 2015 why he had refused

Majesty King Mswati III to dissolve to live in the house at Waterford that was previously occupied by Masuku. Dlamini said it was because of water shortage and that it was built on swampy grounds which could all put his and family's lives in danger of contracting sicknesses.

A total of five victims of the quantums collision will be transferred to the Mbabane Government Hospital from Good Shepherd.

Doctors noted that they needed special attention.

About 13 passengers who were aboard a Quantum along the Lukhula-Siteki road were admitted to Good Shepherd Hospital when the vehicles collided head-on on Monday.

Three died on the spot.

The condition of the admitted victims was by yesterday reported to be stable, except that five of them require further examination and special care.

Senior Medical Officer Dr Koshy disclosed that four of the victims will be transferred to the Mbabane Government Hospital today while the other one would be transferred tomorrow.

Koshy said the five victims sustained serious fractures on the body.

"They are expected to receive care from a bone specialist in that hospital since we do not have that kind of an expert and machinery here," he said.

Meanwhile, Koshy said the rest of the victims were responding well to medication as some have already been dis-

It was reported that most of the victims sustained varying fractures on the lower part of the bodies.

E17m drugs were mine - Tanzanian

THE Tanzanian suspect in the E17 million heroin case admitted that he was indeed found in possession of the illegal drugs at the Ngwenya Border Gate.

Katala Nasser Mohamed has also agreed that on November 16, 2017, he was conveying the illegal diamophine known as heroin which is a poisonous drug to the Republic of South Africa.

According to a statement of agreed facts submitted before court yesterday, Mohamed, who is represented by lawyer Sabelo 'Chicken' Dlamini, further confessed that he was found unlawfully and without a written permit exporting the 30 kilograms to South Africa and that the motor

modified in such a way that a secret compartment where the drugs were hidden was fitted in the vehicle.

According to the statement of agreed facts signed by both defence counsels Dlamini and Principal Crown Counsel Macebo Nxumalo, it is common cause that the accused was arrested at the Ngwenya border while driving the motor vehicle registered FW 03 GD GP on the said date and was subsequently charged with four counts.

He was initially slapped with three counts of contravening the Pharmacy Act and one count of contravening the Customs Act.

However, the last count of contravening the Customs Act was withdrawn by the crown at the close if its case yesterday morning.

It is also common cause that the indictment spells it loud and clear that in the event the accused is convicted, the Crown will apply for forfeiture of the motor vehicle in terms of Section 12(3) (b) of the Pharmacy Act.

The Tanzanian national pleaded guilty to the three counts of contravening the Pharmacy Act, which are those of being found in possession and conveying the heroin to South Africa.

It was in November 16, 2017 at around 14:30 hours that Detective Constable Njabuliso Sibandze, who is stationed at Ngwenya Border Gate, searched the motor vehicle that was driven by the accused while executing his duties.

The police officer was in the company of Constable Nhlabatsi anda security guard.

Upon searching the vehicle, officer Sibandze noticed a foreign compartment underneath the boot and requested the accused person to park aside so he could conduct a

> thorough search and when the spare wheel was lifted, there was a metal sheet covering the access to the compartment.

The officer then noticed some packets wrapped with black plastic bags inside the compartment and forcefully removed the metal sheet and retrieved the packets

where upon he suspected that the plastic bags contained cracked cocaine.

More officers were called to witness the discovery and the accused person was eventually taken to the Mbabane Police Station for questioning and the packets were taken for testing and it was discovered that the contents were diamophine known as heroin.

The motor vehicle was also taken to KIA Motors for examination and they wrote a letter informing the police that their cars do not have such compartments and that same was modified.

The home affairs ministry also furnished the police with the movement of the accused in and out of the Ngwenya and Lomhasha borders while using the same car.

The crown yesterday closed its case and the matter was postponed to next week for submissions by both counsels.

NEW MAYOR ZEPHANIAH TO DECIDE MHLONGO'S FUTUR

WARD 1 Councillor Zephaniah Nkambule has replaced Sikhatsi Dlamini as the Mayor of Mbabane.

Nkambule was elected into the mayoral position for the third time in his life as a councillor during elections that were held at Mbabane Municipal Council chambers yesterday.

His election comes at a time when the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the city Gideon Mhlongo is under suspension. A resolution to put him on ice was taken

When pressed on the matter after his election, Nkambule said the future of Mhlongo would be decided in the first sitting he will convene although he did not give a specific date. Mhlongo was suspended by councillors under the mayorship of Sikhatsi Dlamini that ended on Monday due to what they termed irregularities in his soon to elapse contract. Having been elected new mayor in the midst of the issue, Nkambule said the matter would make an item in the next council's meeting which he said will be held soon.

"I cannot say much on that issue because we still have to discuss it and forge a way forward hence we will discuss it in our next meeting as a council," he said. Nkambule said among other issues to be discussed is that of the ratepayers where the council is yet to decide on the request by zone leaders in the capital city to have the less privileged, particularly the elderly, exempted from paying the rates because they can't afford them.

During the elections, Nkambule had been nominated with Simanga Gama for the top city post and on two occasions, the votes were equal at six. A random ballot, which is in accordance with council's constitution, was employed thereafter and Nkambule came out victorious.

The random ballot or single stochastic vote is an electoral system in which an election is decided on the basis of a single randomly selected ballot.

The results were announced by the council's Bongani Dlamini. Four names emerged in the deputy mayor nominations and these were Skhumbuzo Dube, Sithembiso Hlanze, Musa Dlamini and Simanga Gama. Dlamini and Hlanze were eliminated for



Bongani appointed acting Mbabane CEO

FOLLOWING the suspension of Mbabane Municipal Council Chief Executive Officer Gideon Mhlongo, long serving employee Bongani Dlamini has been appointed as acting CEO.

Dlamini was the chairman of the elections that were held at council's chambers yesterday to designate the council's new mayor.

The former public relations officer of the council conducted the proceedings, particularly at the election of mayor, but he later handed over to Zephaniah Nkambule after the latter's election as

having the least votes while Gama attained seven votes in the second round to be elected as the deputy to Nkambule. In other elections, outgoing mayor Sikhatsi Dlamini was elected as the Chairman of the Finance Committee while his deputy is Sabelo Magagula. Members of the committee are Mbutfo Nhlengetfwa and TV Dlamini.

Addressing the gathering after being elected mayor, Nkambule expressed gratefulness to the councillors for believing in him to once again take the position of

Before getting on with the elections, the acting CEO first read regulations under elections from the council's constitution before the main item of the meeting kicked off.

Ex-RSSC boss drowns in dam

RETIRED Royal Swaziland Sugar Corporation (RSSC) Potable Water Resources Foreman Hendry Mkhwanazi drowned at Mvuleni Dam on Tuesday.

Mkwanazi is said to have gone to fetch water as usual from the dam which he used for watering his garden when he met his tragic death.

The incident happened at about 10am on May Day at Mliba in the Manzini region. The former foreman took an early retirement in 2016 through the voluntary exit plan which was famously known as 'Khukhulela Ngoco'.

According to the family spokesperson Busi, the car that was driven by Mkhwanazi plunged into the dam while his grandchildren were loading water containers on the bakkie.

"The car was parked in reverse parking style so it could be easier for the children to put back the water containers," she said.

It is said as they did that it gained motion and moved in reverse with the old man on aboard. It eventually plunged into the dam.

"We are not sure what really happened since we were not around and the ordeal was narrated to us by the children who witnessed the incident," she said. The children were able to rush and report back home what had befallen their grandfather.

Police from Mliba Police Station arrived at the scene and they found the car submerged in the dam. A search party was launched into the dam. Mkhwanazi, who is the grandson of Reverend Joseph Mzema Mkhwanazi of the Church of the Nazarene, was retrieved by the police scuba divers at about 12:30 noon.

"He was taken to the nearest hospital (Dvokolwako Health Centre) and after the doctors certified him

dead he was taken to Dups mortuary in Manzini," she added. The red GMW van which was fully submerged on the still water was retrieved by the Swaziland National Fire and Emergency Services in the afternoon. He is survived by his wife, eight children and nine grandchildren.

'We will greatly miss him for the fact that he was the pillar of the family and the community at large," she said.

Mkhwanazi worked for RSSC for 35 years. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed the matter.

On Tuesday at about 10:00 hours, a 61-year-old man of Mliba was discovered to have drowned while at Mvuleni Dam," he said. Mamba said his body was retrieved by police scuba divers from the dam. Meanwhile, RSSC Group Public Affairs Manager Sifiso Nyembe said they have learnt with shock and disbelief of the tragic death of their former colleague who served the company with diligence for more than three decades. "We send our condolences to his

family and pray that the Lord comforts them during this sad moment," he said.

MPs grill Cabinet over roads

CABINET ministers have once again been at the receiving end of MPs' tongue lashing over the bad state of roads.

The Members of Parliament (MPs) bitterly complained that government was doing nothing to normalise the situation on the roads. The legislators stated that the situation was bad such that there was no road in this country that had no bad patches or potholes. The lawmakers were responding to a motion moved by Kubuta MP Njabulo Mabuza.

Mabuza moved a motion of privilege to order Minister for Public Works and Transport Lindiwe Dlamini to do something to improve the situation about the country's roads.

Mabuza said the nation was now asking if they were well represented in Parliament because MPs seemed not to care about the situation. It had been a long time since the roads had been regravelled, making it difficult for any vehicle to move in the country. The MP said the problem, according to workers in the works ministry, was fuel. When fuel was there, the operators of the necessary machinery would not be available because they were be locked surface.





Commentary

Despite the fact that a weakening economy limits spending on leisure and entertainment, an overall revenue growth of 6.2% was achieved if compared to the 12 months ended 31 December 2016. The hospitality side of the business achieved a 7.8% growth compared to a 3.5% growth on the gaming side.

Tables business reflected a growth of 20.3% whilst slots business recorded a shortfall of 3.4% on the prior year. Although there is a general slowdown in gaming business in Southern Africa the situation was compounded by challenges faced with the Mozambique market.

The growth in hospitality revenue is attributed to an increase in international and non-campaign business which increased by 45% and 34.9% respectively, whilst overall the corporate business, group and convention business, sport and leisure business and local campaign business declined by 15.9%. The increase of 10.1% on the prior year in food and beverage revenues is the direct result of an increase in outside catering functions held during this financial year. The room occupancy increased by 0.6% points whilst the room rate was 4.1% up on the prior year

Direct costs increased by 2.3% despite an increase in room nights sold and food covers served. Change in financial year end

Tenant wins eviction appeal against The Gables

By Sandile Nkambule Supreme Court

A tenant at The Gables Shopping Centre has successfully appealed against the decision of the High Court which had ruled in favour of The Gables to the effect that he should pay arrear rentals and further be evicted from the shopping centre.

Siyakhokha Investments (appellant), which runs a Pharmacy, had filed the appeal against an applicant that was won by The Gables for cancellation of its lease agreement and eviction from the premises as well as payment of arrear rentals.

The court a quo (High Court) had found that the original contract of lease lapsed and that the current lease, which is the subject of litigation, was a month to month contract concluded by the parties pursuant to the lapse of the original one. storety of:

The court a quo held that the appellant was in affear rentals which had accumulated to a total amount of E179 710.32 and the respondent (The Gables) lodged an application on ex parte basis to effect a landlords hypothec in respect of the arrear rentals and evict the appellant from the premises.

The respondent further lodged another application urgent application against the appellant for arrear rentals amounting to E122 158.61 in respect of the same premises.

Seating with Judges Dr Odoki and Phesheya Dlamini, the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala. in his judgment stated that there was no need for the respondent, to lodge a second application but what was required for the respondent was to execute the outstanding payment.

The chief justice stated that appellant had reduced the original debt by making periodic payments and consequently the appellant had vacated the premises pursuant to the High Court order issued in November 13, 2015.

The parties concluded a contract of lease on October 25, 2010 in terms of which the respondent leased premises to the appellant to conduct a pharmaceutical business with the leased premises described as shop No 40 at The Gables trading as Galleria Shopping Centre portion 119, a portion of portion 60 (21) of Farm 51 Ezulwini and the monthly rental was E80 per square metre.

The chief justice stated that it is trite law that a court lacks jurisdiction to determine and pronounce itself upon a matter that is res judicata and that the basis of the principle is that the court which pronounced on the matter becomes functus officio.

"Accordingly, the following order is made, the appeal is upheld, the respondent will pay cost of suit on the ordinary scale," the chief justice pronounced.

Representing the appellant in the matter was Manzini based lawyer Macilongo Ndlovu while the respondent was represented by Wandile Mavuso.

Limkokwing SRC faces suspension

LIMKOKWING University of Creative Technology (LUCT) Student Representative Council (SRC) could be suspended after the management accused them of acting in common interest in the class boycott in March.

The management first served the SRC with a letter on April 10, where they asked them to show cause why the university should not suspend them for the remainder of the semester in the event they did not give satisfactory reasons.

The management said their investigations suggested that the SRC allegedly violated the university's regulations by hosting unlawful meetings, activities and gatherings without prior permission from the management.

The SRC has been served with yet another letter which slapped them with five counts for the contravention of the High Flyers manual rule.

The counts include convening unlawful meetings and gatherings early March near sheltered students seating area without prior permission from management, unauthorised use of university logo without written permission from management, failing to comply with all institutional rules as amended from time to time and engaging, leading, initiating and supporting an unlawful boycott.

"We are holding our breath that they reverse their decision because we can't afford to be suspended at this time of the year," said a member of the SRC.

The students have been summoned for hearing today and it has been reliably gathered that they might be suspended.

There was total pandemonium at Limkokwing University mid-March when armed police used rubber bullets, detained eight students after a class boycott turned ugly. The students boycotted classes and

THE case involving alleged serial killer and rapist, Vusi Phineas Dlamini will be affected by the death of Principal Crown Counsel Stanley Dlamini, who was prosecuting in the matter.

The Principal Crown Counsel had been seized with the matter which was already part-heard before High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze.

Before his death, Dlamini had already paraded more than 10 witnesses including Magistrate Florence Msibi.

According to some of his colleagues, this is not the only case that will be affected by Dlamini's death as others he was prosecuting will now have to be allocated to other prosecutors.

Dlamini died tragically when he was allegedly stoned to death by a civil servant Nelisa Hlatjwako after an altercation at Msunduza last Saturday.

The case involving the serial killer has been grounded as the suspect was admitted to the Mbabane Government Hospital

SERIAL 'KILLER RAPIST' CASE TO BE AFFECTED BY PROSECUTOR'S DEATH

 Principal Crown counsel Stanley Dlamini has been seized with the part heard serial killer case of Vusi Phineas Dlamini

and Dlamini had indicated last week that the suspect has since been discharged from hospital and was hoping to have the case resume in the next session of the High Court.

Accused

Vusi Dlamini is accused of raping and killing eight women at Elangeni area between 2008 and 2009, with some having their bodies mutilated.

According to the charge sheet where a list of the witnesses has been attached, the list of witnesses comprises spouses of the deceased, their parents and police officers.

The list also includes people who had discovered the bodies of the deceased which had been dumped in different places, mostly along rivers at Elangeni, Somnjalose, Lozitha and along the Lusushwana River, to name a few.

The suspect allegedly raped and killed Xolile Sylvia Maphanga on June3, 2008 near Elangeni.

It has not been established yet whether he first raped the

woman and killed her after or if he killed her first. The state has attached reports from a medical practitioner who examined the bodies of all the deceased.

Killed

He is further accused of having killed Agnes Mthembu on May 29, 2008 at Elangeni.

On January 13, 2009, he allegedly killed and raped Lucia Magagula near Lozitha in the Hhohho region.

Sometimes in March 2009, the suspect had unlawful sexual intercourse with Sakhile Manikela near the Lusushwana River and he has been charged with rape and murder.

The state has so far failed to identify a woman who was allegedly killed and raped by the accused near Mtilane River in the Manzini region.

He is further accused of having raped and killed Nolwazi Msibi on June 2, 2009 near LaMgabhi in the Hhohho region.

On count 11, he allegedly killed Nobahle Dlamini and dumped her body at Somnjalose area on April 7, 2009. He is further accused of raping and killing Dudu Mabaso on October 24, 2009 at Unitrans River in Pigg's Peak.

Ex-Nedbank CFO demands E400 000 for unfair dismissal

FORMER Chief Financial Officer (CFO) of Nedbank Swaziland Dumisani Kunene has taken the bank to court where he is demanding E400 000 for unfair dismissal.

Kunene, who was employed as CFO between 1992 and 2002, is claiming a total of E126 515.48 in respect of terminal benefits and E251 356.56 in respect of compensation for unfair dismissal with interest at a rate of nine percent per annum.

Appearing before Judge President of the Industrial Court Sifiso Sibandze yesterday, Kunene stated that he was dismissed from the bank after being charged for

gross negligence after allegations by the management to the effect that he was responsible for the loss of E10 million incurred by the bank.

He stated that he was hauled before a disciplinary hearing which found him guilty as charged and later appealed the matter, an appeal which was however not successful.


He told the court that there were no supporting documents on how the E10 million was lost under his care as CFO.

"As CFO I was responsible for financial control of bank's finances and during that time the bank was in a transition to change from Standard Chartered to Nedbank, I was dismissed after being

charged with gross negligence in the loss of E10 million which I appealed," Kunene said. He submitted that before the transition, the finance department was reporting to the Marketing and Strategy Department.

According to the claim breakdown, Kunene wants payment of E20 946.38 notice pay and additional notice pay four times. He is also claiming severance allowance calculated at E75 406.50 and E30 162.60 respectively all of which forms part of his terminal benefits while the E251 356.56 is in respect of unfair dismissal. However, the bank has submitted that the claims have not been certified unresolved as contemplated by Section 85 (1) of the Industrial Relations Act of 2000.

Another man fined for dagga cultivation

THE cultivation of dagga is evidently on the rise in the Lubombo region as yet another man appeared before the Magistrate's Court on Monday after he was arrested for cultivating the illegal herb.

Sabelo Matse (34) was nabbed while working on the fields situated at Sitsatsaweni near the border separating the country and neighbouring Mozambique. He appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso,

where he faced a charge of contravening the pharmacy Act. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully cultivate 250 plants of dagga.

When told of his rights to legal representation, the accused person elected to conduct his own defence. He further pleaded guilty to the charge, and his plea was accepted by the Crown.

The Crown however highlighted that the accused person had committed a serious crime which was quickly becoming a trend in the region. Apparently, the dagga plants were said to be at a stage of ripening when the accused person was arrested.

During mitigation, the accused person asked the court to be lenient when passing the sentence. He stated that he intended to sell the dagga upon harvesting as a way to make money.

The accused person said he was unemployed, a situation which he said drove him to committing the crime. He was reportedly guarding the illegal herb when he was arrested.

The accused was accordingly found guilty of the crime and was sentenced to a year in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.

MPs reject Hillary's Bill over ACC matter

Hillary was reportedly against the move by the MPs, saying they were straying by so doing.

Khumalo was supported by Mbabane West MP Johane Shongwe. He said he was also not going to take part in debating bills involving the justice ministry because he also felt disrespected by the minister.

The MPs said this after House of Assembly Speaker Themba Msibi had warned them on the habit of not forming a quorum.

Msibi said this negatively affected the work of the legislators as they had to enact some legislations that were tabled before the House on a certificate of urgency. One of them was the Election of Women in to the House of Assembly Bill of 2018.

By the time the elections were done later this year, the bill was supposed to have been passed so that it could be used to ensure that women rep-

resentation in the House of Assembly reached at least 30 percent. The bill was supposed to be debated on Monday.

However, the bill could not be debated as MPs did not form a quorum. The MPs who were in the House at the time debated on what to do if MPs did not form a quorum.

Ludzeludze MP Bambumuti Sithole said under such circumstances, MPs who were still in the House had to be recorded. It was not clear what was going to happen to those who moved out, causing the quorum not to be formed.


Lomshiyo is not the only chiefdom that is frequented by Emaswati in South Africa on the King's instruction, as there are 12 others, and most of these have roots within the country.

Why people abandoned culture

EUROPEANS have been blamed for Africans They would do this by introducing the British abandoning their own culture.

Dr. Mafika Lubisi, who is the MEC for Sports, Culture and Recreation in Mpumalanga Province, South Africa, said Africans shot themselves on the foot by allowing Europeans to influence them to abandon their culture, which defined them as Africans.

He said there was Lord MacAulay, a British nationality, who in February 1835, wrote to the British Parliament, telling them about Africans and how they lived. He intended to give them tips on how Africa could be controlled by the

That meant the missionaries would preach the Gospel in a way that would protect the interests of the Belgians in Congo. The king said it will not be wise to preach the Gospel to people who already knew it.

They already knew that to lie, kill, commit adultery, and steal was bad. They submitted to their own gods.

Luhhwahhweni is a tiny community of Lonhlupheko, situated along a boundary separating the community and Hlane Game Reserve.

For the past years, the area has been embroiled in a land dispute as some homesteads were reportedly situated on land belonging to the game reserve. The dispute saw the Lubombo RA toping in the surveyor general's office, attorney general's office, KaLanga Chiefdom and other authorities in a bid to amicably resolve the issue.

Mthethwa and a delegation from the aforementioned offices made her first visit to the area in November last year, where the residents were engaged on the matter.

In a previous interview with this publication, Mthethwa disclosed that authorities of the game reserve were advised to revisit the boundary and erect a fence so that it could be clear to anyone.

Mthethwa's delegation was back in the area on Monday to overseer the exercise of reviewing the boundaries as directed by officials from the surveyor general's office.

Upon noticing a grader and the RA's convoy in the area, residents alerted each other and gathered near the boundaries

As the tractor cleared the path, it became evident that some homesteads, fields and grazing lands were now situated inside the game reserve. This situation is said to have sparked anger amongst the residents as they started hurling unpalatable words at some of the officials while watching the exercise from a distance.

It was at this moment that police officers who were present called for back-up from their colleagues. Moments later, a fully loaded police van arrived after the RA and her delegation had left.

When speaking randomly to our news crew, the residents alleged that they were not properly engaged on the matter. One elderly woman, Grace Gamedze (65) said she had lived her entire life in the area, but only to be told that her homestead was situated on the wrong side of the boundary.

"I was born here, and have always lived

here only to be told that my homestead is not supposed to be where it is," she said.

She was echoed by one John Maziya who pointed out that the review of the boundary has taken away some of their fields and grazing land.

The residents said they were still hoping to have the matter addressed, and an amicable resolution reached.

"We are willing to cooperate with the authorities but we are certainly not ready to allow the game reserve to take away our land," said Maziya.

Meanwhile, Mthethwa confirmed her visit and the undertaking of the exercise on Monday. The RA had contacted this publication while at the site together with the officials.

However, she could not be reached for further comments on the matter when she was called yesterday as her mobile phone rang unanswered.

GRADE ONE PUPIL BITTEN BY SNAKE

A Grade One pupil attending school at Black Mbuluzi Nazarene Primary in Dvokolwako is currently fighting for his life at Mbabane Government Hospital after he was bitten by an unidentified snake near Black Mbuluzi River.

The boy, aged six, had gone for his usual swimming expedition in the river at Tsakasile area with his friends when he was bitten by the reptile on the leg. According to his mother Samukelisiwe Thwala, the incident happened on April 19, which was the day of 50/50 celebrations. The mother said they spent a week at Dvokolwako Health Centre and were last Thursday transferred to Mbabane Government Hospital.

His friends told her mother that he started crying, saying something had bitten him while grabbing his leg. "At first they did not pay attention to him because they thought he was playing. He is of a playful nature," narrated the mother. However, the type of snake could not be identified



by the boys. She said one of his friends then saw a snake near where he had been seated. "They suspect the snake bit him and vanished into the nearby bush. They said everything happened so fast," she said. She said one of the boys rushed back home to report the incident while the others tried to rescue him. "We called the 977 Emergency Medical Services and they rushed him to Dvokolwako Health Centre," she said. She said a week later, the doctor told her that since the leg was not improving, they would transfer him to the Mbabane Government Hospital. "On Thursday last week, we were transferred to the Mbabane Government Hospital," she said. She has not seen any improvement yet. However, she stated that at Dvokolwako Health Centre her son was changed bandages three times a day while at Mbabane Government they skip a day and then put a new bandage.

The mother did not allow the media to take a picture of his son as she said she was still to consult with the father and the family

Thwala said it is not the first time a child in his family is bitten by a snake as he is reported to be the third one in the family to suffer such setback. "Last year, a nephew of mine was bitten by a snake also at Tsakasile," she said, thus mentioning that this is now worrying.

PICK N PAY ALCOHOL THIEF WANTED TO SELL VODKA

IN a quest to make ends meet, unemployed Sandziso Dlamini was charged with stealing a 750ml bottle of Smirnoff Vodka at Pick n Pay on Monday.

Dlamini appeared before Mbabane Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini and said he stole the alcohol with the intention of selling it.

"I urge the court to be lenient with me because I'm unemployed and I was trying to make ends meet. I usually get money from washing cars at a local car wash but that is not enough to sustain my family hence I resorted to stealing alcohol. I grew up with no parents and I hustle for a living," he said. Dlamini said he was staying with his disabled uncle and sister and he was the only one providing for them. He was also charged with being

found in possession of 3grams of dagga which he said was for his own consumption. He was sentenced to five months imprisonment or a fine option of E600 for the first count and four months imprisonment or a fine of E500 on the second count. Both counts ran consecutively, with the fines accumulating to E1 100.

In another case, 44-year-old Thulan Shongwe of Mdumezulu and Bonginkhosi Dlamini of Mnyokane were charged with acting jointly in assaulting Abednigo Nkambule with open hands, fists, kicks several times all over the body and further banged his head several times on the ground with intent to cause him grievous bodily harm. The incident occurred this past Sunday. Bail was opposed and they were remanded back to custody until May 11 pending the recovery of the complainant in hospital.

Dagga dealer pays for siblings school fees

A dagga dealer who was found in possession of 0.5 kg marijuana told Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini that he was a breadwinner and paying for school fees for his two sisters.

Simanga Ngwenya of Lavundlamanti was nabbed with the illegal substance while at Nkoyoyo on Monday and he appeared before court yesterday.

The 27-year-old Ngwenya told the court that he was staying with his mother, grandmother and two of his sisters and they were all depending on him as he was the breadwinner.

"I promise not to be found in possession of dagga ever again because I can't afford to be away from my family.

They are all depending on me and I also pay for the school fees for my two sisters,"

he said.

Ngwenya was sentenced to two years imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000.


In a similar case, Sifiso Nkambule of Lobamba was nabbed with 0.3 grams of dagga while driving a car at Ngwenya Border Gate and he was in the company of Gcina Dlamini.

Nkambule pleaded with the court to be lenient with him as he was not dealing with the drug but he was usually lending the car to his brother whom he thinks uses it for unlawful acts.

"I'm currently unemployed and if it pleases the court, I would prefer to have whatever fine imposed on me paid in instalments because I can't afford to pay for it all at once. I survive by selling clothes," he said.

Nkambule was sentenced to two years imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000.

MINOR (12) RAPED 3 TIMES BY NEIGHBOUR AT VUS

Stories by Sizwe Dlamini Pigg's Peak

A man has been accused of raping a minor aged 12 at knife point.

Sihle Mthupha* (35) appeared before Principal Magistrate Joe Gumedze for raping the young girl who is also the accused's neighbour.

It is said Mthupha raped the minor three times on separate occasions in 2017 at knife point while fetching water at Vusweni. It is alleged that the second rape incident happened while Mthupha was watering his dagga plants at the back of his homestead.

According to domestic violence officer at the Pigg's Peak Police Station, Sifiso Simelane, who was speaking after the arrest of Mthupha on Sunday, the first rape incident occurred while the survivor was returning home from school. "In one of the incidents, Mthupha who is a close friend of the survivor's father, called the minor who was unsuspecting and dragged her to a nearby bush.

He proceeded to rape her at knife point and to make the situation even worse, the accused did not use a condom. After the first incident, the accused then told his crying survivor that he will kill her if she spoke about her ordeal," the officer said.

He added that after the first rape, a few days later, as the minor was going to fetch water, he was called by Mthupha who was allegedly watering his dagga at the back of his homestead. Simelane

said the minor knew what Mthupha was up-to and tried to flee, but the accused managed to catch up with the survivor where he led her to the bushes and proceeded to rape her.

He said on the second instance, after

the rape, the accused again supposedly told the minor that he would kill her with the knife if she mentioned her ordeal to anybody.

The accused allegedly raped the minor in

December in the same fashion.

In March, while at the Vusweni healthcare facility with a nurse under Young Heroes, the minor was finally able to relate her terrible ordeal. After the short interview between the

nurse and the survivor, the police were informed and Mthupha was arrested.

After hearing the testimony, the magistrate said the trial would continue on July 16.

She then advised the workers against agents of destruction.


"SEIWU appreciates the effort of Montigny Group for providing a number of jobs in the country.

LUBANE Savings and Credit Cooperative on Monday hosted a joint schools cooperative workshop at Ezulwini in collaboration with Junior Achievement (JA).

The cooperative conducted the workshop in their offices to support a JA initiative of the youth called 'in school youth cooperative programme.'

Over 60 pupils from eight schools that are participants of the JA schools cooperative programme participated.

They were trained on how to save money, the operations of cooperatives; and were later awarded with certificates of attendance.

The pupils are to elect the cooperative management amongst themselves, which will then be assisted by Lubane to open and manage its account using the JA financial handling principles used in its (JA) company programme.

JA Chairperson Nokukhanya Gamedze said this was the first step towards creating a financially stable country.

She said the school's cooperative programme has kicked off with tremendous success recording over E17 000 savings from the school youth in just two months.

Gamedze said this is an amount that has been a collective effort of 1 433 members who are part of the in school cooperative programme so far.

"As we develop this generation of saving individuals, this shall become a culture and in the long run, the evidence will be visible in the lives of our people as they enjoy financial stability," she said.

On that note, JA Swaziland Executive



Director Siboniso Madlopha also shared his excitement for the positive start of the programme.

"The introduction of school going youth cooperatives seems to have positively influenced young people to view saving in a positive light," he said.

Currently the program has 13 active cooperatives that have been assembled in 13 schools.

Madlopha said they are aspiring to hit the targeted 40 schools as the programme progresses.

"It is a very proud moment to note that out of the 13 active cooperatives, 11 are from rural schools.

This is a positive change that young people in these schools are not lagging behind in mastering the art of saving as part of their financial literacy education," he added. Dvokolwako High School is currently leading with over E6 000 savings in just a period of two months.

"The funds that have been received are already with Lubane Savings Cooperatives who is responsible for the safe guarding and also ensuring that they accrue interest on a monthly basis," he said.

JA Swaziland also works collaboratively with the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade under the cooperatives department to implement this programme.

Lubane will be responsible for managing the in school cooperative account on behalf of JA Swaziland.

It will also invest the savings from pupils so as to ensure that they accrue interest that will benefit the learners.

Meanwhile, Lubane Marketing Officer Nhlakanipho Dlamini said "every pupil under the cooperative will have a Lubane membership number which they will use to check their monthly statements on the cooperative's website."He also said, Lubane is currently in the process of registering all forms submitted to their system.

He said they would also facilitate more workshops and visit schools to educate on financial literacy and the importance of creating a savings cul-

Cooperative promotes saving at CIT

LUBANE Savings and Credit Cooperative also engaged CIT students to save for a brighter financial future.

Lubane has since taken the initiative to get tertiary institution students to consider saving their finances.

Lubane Marketing Officer Nhlakanipho Dlamini said the students only want three things from to a savings account.

"They don't want to pay any administration fees, they want easy access to their money and they want good interest rates," he said.

He said Lubane's secondary savings account provided a platform where students could save and withdraw their money anytime while considering the importance and value of saving.

MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE (MR)

IN their latest publication titled "Turning point for Africa", the joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) notes that a decade of progress has inspired the once unthinkable — that the AIDS epidemic can be ended as a public health threat.

The UNAIDS emphasises that the global community has embraced the bold idea to end AIDS epidemic as a target of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and that governments across the world have committed to a fast-track agenda and a set of ambitious but attainable milestones to be achieved in order to end the AIDS epidemic by 2030, as set out in the United Nations General Assembly Political Declaration on Ending AIDS.

The Kingdom of Eswatini, with the dubious honour of being the country with the highest HIV prevalence, has (as commanded by His Majesty King Mswati III) set out to achieve these global targets by 2022.


Buoyed by the results of the Swaziland HIV Incidence Measurement Survey (SHIMS) 2, the country's HIV response is optimistic that the target of "An AIDS-free Kingdom of Eswatini" is within reach. As it is, through the leadership of the National Emergency Response Council on HIV/AIDS (NERCHA) under the Prime Minister's Office, the HIV response has been working on a new National Multisectoral HIV and AIDS Strategic Framework (NSF) designed to propel the country towards Ending AIDS as a public health threat, in the period 2018 - 2022.

The new strategy will build on the huge successes of the extended National Strategic Framework (eNSF) 2014 – 2018, during whose time, the country saw new HIV infections decline by 44 per cent; 84 per cent of PLHIV put on ART; and effort accelerated to reduce vulnerabilities to HIV infection among key and priority populations.

The recently ended eNSF

The eNSF's "combination prevention approach" combined biomed-

ical, behavioural, social, and structural interventions based on the country context and effectiveness, was further supported by an investment approach to prioritise 5 specific interventions using limited resources.

These interventions included: accelerated scale-up of antiretroviral therapy (ART) for PLHIV; scaling up voluntary medical male circumcision (VMMC); innovative HIV prevention approaches for girls and young women; elimination of mother-to-child transmission of HIV (EMTCT) and intensifying tuberculosis (TB)/HIV co-infection diagnosis and treatment.

Through guidance from the eNSF, the country's HIV response prioritise reducing the number of new infections and keep PLHIV alive and on treatment for the country's entire fiscal sustainability.

The country, through its multi-sectoral response to HIV and AIDS, has, obtained positive results in areas such as: reduction of new infections, EMTCT, reduction of HIV prevalence amongst young people, reduction of AIDS-related deaths, scaling up of VMMC among young people, strengthening interventions for key populations, and the promotion and distribution of condoms.

Clear vision to end AIDS

From 1999 when His Majesty King Mswati III declared HIV and AIDS a national disaster, and government introduced a multi-sectoral approach to responding to the epidemic - through launching a Cabinet Committee on HIV and AIDS and a Crisis Management and Technical Committee (CMTC) The Kingdom of Eswatini has always had a clear vision in respond-

ing to the HIV epidemic, to further strengthen the country effort to achieve a positive and fruitful national response, in 2003, NERCHA was established through an Act of Parliament, to replace the CMTC and fast-track a relevant multi-sectoral HIV and AIDS that placed HIV and AIDS at the centre of the country's development agenda.

Currently, the country has a clear vision for ending AIDS by 2022. It has introduced several interventions to eliminate new infections especially among young girls whom according to both the SHIMS one and two, show peak incidences.

Through the collective contribution of multi-sectoral partners in government, civil society organisations, people living with HIV, communities and development partners, the country has stabilised the HIV pandemic.

The aim remains to end AIDS by 2022 and the country has adopted the concept of reaching zero new infections, zero AIDS related deaths and zero HIV stigma and discrimination.

Through its combined efforts the country has been able to scale up its treatment, care and support interventions to achieve the third 90 wherein 91 per cent of PLHIV on treatment are virally suppressed, while getting very close to the first and second.

Given the complexity of the response, the country continues to intensify advocacy for strengthening HIV synergies within the development sector. This includes interventions which promote a shift from social welfare to social development, through multisectoral coordination with joint planning and budgets.

The key priority is to prevent new

HIV infections by strengthening interventions for vulnerable groups: orphans and vulnerable children (OVC), women and girls and other groups. There is need for continued and enhanced support for critical synergies, including social protection, systems (health, education and community) strengthening, food security and nutrition.

The use of traditional communitybased safety nets to care for vulnerable populations in communities has yielded good results.

The establishment of *Kagogo* centres to coordinate the provision of cocial services for OVC in communities, has helped mitigate the impacts of the epidemic. The country also built community neighbour care points (NCPs) to support OVC with basic human needs.

Living with HIV has been transformed to chronic disease management by the successful national ART, treatment and care programme, and this has contributed to increased viral load suppression in PLHIV in the country.

The 2015 estimates and projections show that the country will experience a further decline in incidence by 2020. The HIV incidence among young people aged 15–24 years has also been reduced for both males and females even though they remain high at 1.9% for females and 0.9% for males. This indicates that adolescents and young people still need to be at the centre of the response.

Call to action

This week, the US Embassy hosted Phill Wilson (President and Chief Executive Officer of the Black AIDS

Institute – a training and mobilization centre focused exclusively on black people) who had scheduled sessions with various stakeholders in the country's HIV response. During one of the sessions, Wilson who was diagnosed with HIV at 24 years and told to go home and get his affairs in order as he would die within 6 months, told participants that fear is people's worst enemy in the HIV response.

"The biggest threat in the HIV response and the target to end AIDS is not the PLHIV on treatment but those that do not know their HIV status" he said. He stated that the biggest fear after taking the HIV test is that of disclosure, and people are more afraid of the stigma than the disease. In a call to action, he reflected on the words of Martin Luther King Jr who said, 'Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter" and "Courage faces fear and thereby masters it."

Wilson noted that courage is not the absence of fear but what you do while you are afraid.

He said that even though there is still no vaccine or cure for HIV, the world now has available the tools, that are necessary to end AIDS. There are now available surveillance tools; new diagnostic tools, free simple tests, better treatment tools; and bio-medical prevention tools. To reach the end of AIDS however, he said there is need for all to step up and play their role. "If you won't do it, no one can" he emphasised.

Despite the many achievements that the country has realised in the 50 years of independence, the HIV response needs to do more to reach the last mile, by reducing new infections and ensuring no one is left behind.

About 6 500 new infection occurred in 2017, while 15 per cent of PLHIV are presently not in care; and TB/HIV co-infection rate is at 70 per cent, with other co-morbidities emerging as a threat to the lives of PLHIV. The challenge is for us (individually and collectively) to become the leaders that the country has been waiting for, cast our fears aside and take up the available tools to end AIDS.

Il Timothy 1:7 says "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind", while Isiah 41: 10 states "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

In 2018, there is no reason not to know your HIV status and access free treatment. Play your part in taking the Kingdom of Eswatini to an "AIDS-free 2022" and beyond!



FORMER Kwaluseni Member of Parliament Stella Lukhele had undoubtedly entered politics by accident as it is widely considered as a men's territory in a patriarchal society.

After Kwaluseni community failed to get a candidate of their first choice; her husband, Leonard Lukhele to stand for the national elections, she then became the second best candidate. This community was looking for an educated person to represent them in Parliament, Leonard could not stand because he was employed by the Examinations Council of Swaziland. He then recommended his wife to the four men requesting him to stand for elections.

Purpose

Without knowing the purpose of the first visit, Stella received the four-man delegation to their home in the absence of her husband. She was surprised by their request to stand for the 1998 elections. This came as a shock to her because she did not harbour any political ambitions. Worse still, she loathed doing something she was not trained to do. As a qualified teacher, she would have been happier if it was just

However, she could neither grant nor reject their request without prior consultation with her husband. Culturally, it was beyond her to take such a crucial decision just on her own without the head of the family.

"I didn't object because I saw it as an opportunity to serve my community. But I first needed babe's consent. But I had already started working with women in the community involved in income-generating projects. In their motivation, they recognised me for all the community projects that I was involved, including a bridge that was swept away by heavy floods in the area."

Leonard did not object to the community's request because he was the one who had referred the men to her. With his blessings, she accepted her nomination by the Kwaluseni

She had already served as bucopho in the 6th Parliament under Kwaluseni MP William Msibi, a neighbour in Mbikwakhe area.

"I used to work close-

ly with the late MP William Msibi, who used to share with me his parliamentary papers. The then Deputy Prime Minister Sishayi Nxumalo educated us about the functions of the Tinkhundla system. He explained how we should work closely with imiphakatsi."

It came as no surprise during the 1998 national elections when the Kwaluseni people voted for her, which saw her winning with a landslide. When Prime Minister Barnabas Sibusiso appointed his Cabinet, Stella was first appointed as Minister of Housing and Urban Development. She was shunted later to the ministries of tourism, environment and communication as well as agriculture and cooperatives within the turbulent times of her five-year term in the 8th Parliament.

Asked how she was able to cope with juggling her demanding two jobs, she said nothing beats time management. She created time to perform her ministerial and inkhundla responsibilities. She would take off Thursdays, known as the Women Prayer Day, to meet and consult with her electorate at Kwaluseni Inkhundla. As a result, at no time

her electorate had complained about being neglected and abandoned by their MP. She worked hand-in-hand with the indvuna yenkhundla, whose main task is to receive the people's

requests for projects.

In her capacity as Kwaluseni Inkhundla MP, Stella addressed community needs like roads, bridges and collection of solid waste. She was behind the construction of two roads. bridges and a footbridge and solid waste collection points around Kwaluseni Inkhundla. She laid

Savings and Credit Cooperatives unhappy with proposed SACCO Bill



EVEN before the Savings and Credit Cooperatives Bill (2018) makes its way to Cabinet for approval, several cracks emanating from the lack of a proper stakeholder consultative process in this legislation's formulation have emerged.

One of the key groups affected by the proposed legislation is the Savings and Credit Cooperative (SACCO) movement which has registered downright discontent with the proposed Bill which will soon be taken to Hospital Hill for Cabinet approval.

Such reservations were voiced out by SASCCO President Cambridge Mdlalose yesterday in an interview on the sidelines of the third SACCO Indaba held at Esibayeni Lodge attended by hundreds of delegates. SASCCO is the Swaziland Association of Savings and Credit Co-operatives.

Mdlalose said they were not happy with the Bill because SACCOs and their mother body SASCCO were not given an opportunity to make an input towards it.

"One would naturally expect for cooperatives to be involved in the drafting stages of the SACCO Bill as this law directly affects them.

"Every SACCO should have had an input in the formulation of this piece of legislation, but that was not the case," said Mdlalose, emphasising that the SACCO movement feels robbed of a proper consultative process.

He explained that SASSCO was engaged in a veiled consultative process officially termed as validation of this Bill.

"What we know in our country is that no law goes through without a proper consultative process. Unfortunately, the key stakeholders in the SACCO Bill were not afforded a consultative forum," he complained.

Whilst being openly dissatisfied with the proposed Bill, the SACCO movement is in agreement with certain provisions of this new law such as its proposed extension of the term of office for savings and credit coop-

erative society board members.

Mdlalose described the current two-year period for board members as being too little and detrimental to the growth of cooperatives.

"While many SACCOs are performing well, a few others are riddled with challenges emanating from the mere two-year term," Mdlalose said. He explained that the two-year term of office for SACCO boards is way too minimal and negatively affects cooperatives sustainability.

Registration dilemma for proposed Cooperatives Insurance Company

APPARENT clashes between the Financial Services Regulatory Authority Act and the Cooperatives Act No.5 of 2003 have resulted in a registration dilemma for the proposed Cooperatives Insurance Company whose pioneer is the Swaziland Association of Savings and Credit Cooperatives (SASCCO).

SASCCO claims to have done its homework with regard to establishing a Cooperatives Insurance

Company as they have gone to as far as Kenya to see how other countries implemented this.

The cooperatives mother body has also done extensive local consultation on the proposed insurance company which, however, has not come into being. SASC-CO President Cambridge Mdlalose said in an interview yesterday that the Financial Services Regulatory Authority strongly advised against registering a Cooperatives Insurance

Company whilst the Cooperatives
Act allows for this.
informed delegates attending the

SASCCO is now proposing that the Cooperatives Insurance Company be registered as a public company instead.

However, this move could result in negative consequences, one of which is the exposure to taxation because public companies pay tax while a Cooperative Insurance Company would not be taxed.

In the meantime, Mdlalose

informed delegates attending the third SACCO Indaba that all cooperatives are expected to comply with the Anti-Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism Act (2009) and the Consumer Credit Act of 2016.

The Anti-Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism Act makes it mandatory for all cooperatives to know the sources of income from all investments received from their members.

Eswatini-born tech entrepreneur develops FinTech platform

KR8IV Capital, an online startup lending platform, will - according to inventor Phiwa Nkambule - accelerate transformation in the country.

A study conducted by Finmark Trust on financial inclusion in the country shows that the overall small business sector in Eswatini consisted of about 59 283 business owners in 2017.

About 60 per cent of business owners reported limited access to finance as the leading obstacle in starting a business, 49 per cent of owners reported limited access to finance limiting operations while 25 per cent attributed it to inhibiting growth. Further, analysis showed that only five per cent of businesses access credit from the commercial banking sector.

This suggested that Eswatini, although having suppliers with products channnelled at the small businesses, does not have enough supply. Said Nkambule:

"The platform provides a holistic approach to start-up and small business finance. It will groom the start-ups and small businesses to a point where they are bankable through micro-loans and creating credit history. Kr8iv Capital aims to mostly increase Swazi youth participation in 2017. in global tech ecosystem by providing access to the resources and infrastructure needed to establish digital-first businesses."

The 26-year-old born Nkambule, who was born and raised in Manzini, founded award-winning technology company Cybatar in 2014 and globally recognised South Africabased FinTech company Riovic in

He is recognised as one of the top technology innovators in Africa through his work and was invited to deliver a keynote address on 'Digital Technologies in Insurance' at the 13th International Microinsurance Conference in Peru

"In the traditional banking system, start-ups and small businesses are denied finance due to lack of credit history, finance origination and disbursal takes lots of time. There are high interest rates and other charges, there are lengthy processes and time-consuming paperwork and finance applications are are rejected at a later stage.

We've built a credit scoring and predictive analytics scorecard underwriting platform to help start-ups and small businesses in Eswatini without credit history obtain loans," Nkambule says.

He plans to have an official launch event in the country in June 2018.



> "Genetically modified food is a tool which producers can use to increase their yields, to reduce their input costs, and thus potentially increase profits, while also reducing the environmental impact of agricultural production. I can

not disprove that, and it does not mean there are no longer people that still think they are not safe, but science says GMOs

What they are not is a magic bullet. Yes, they are associated with high upfront costs and even if they do increase yields, if consumers will not accept them there is no market and profits could decrease, which could lead to input resistance," he said.

Professor Nalley noted that South Africa has realised a net cumulative of five percent and 32 per cent between

income gain of approximately E780.71 million (\$65.6 million) since 2003 when that country introduced the commercial growing of herbicide tolerant maize.

He said this amount does not take into consideration any labour cost saving that may arise from the reduced need for hand weeding.

On the other hand, he said genetically modified maize, which has been grown commercially in South Africa since 2000, has resulted in yield gains

2000 and 2004, and 10.6 per cent in 2008 to 2009, with 90 per cent of the country's total maize crop being planted to GM varieties in 2015.

On another note, earlier this year, Minister of Agriculture Moses Vilakati reaffirmed government's stance that the importation of genetically modified crops into the kingdom remains banned, and that there currently is no legal instrument providing for the production of genetically modified crops in Swaziland.



PROHIBITED PRACTISES UNDER THE CONSUMER CREDIT ACT, 2016

THE Consumer Credit Act, 2016 forbids certain practises in the industry that have been prevalent before the enactment of the Act which is aimed at protecting the interests of consumers.

Consumers and credit providers alike need to be aware of what is allowed or not allowed in the industry to avoid disputes that may arise as a result of unfair practises.

Prohibited practises

Section 10 of the Consumer Credit Act, 2016 states that a credit provider shall not-

- a) Request or demand a consumer to-
- i. Give the credit provider temporary or permanent possession of an instrument referred to in Section 27 (1)(b) (i) other than for the purpose of identification, or to make a copy of the instrument.
- ii. Reveal any personal identification code or number contemplated in Section 27 (1)(b)(ii);
- b) Obtain in advance from a consumer a grant of power of attorney to the credit provider in respect of any matter related to the granting of credit in terms of this act;
- c) Require a consumer to sign in advance any documentation relating to enforcement of the agreement, irrespective of whether such documentation is complete or incomplete at the time of signing;
- d) Require a consumer to consent to

a pre-determined value of costs relating to enforcement of the agreement except to the extent that is consistent with the act;

- e) Require, direct or authorise any person engaged in processing payments to give priority to payments for the credit provider over any other credit provider;
- f) Direct, or knowingly permit, any other person to do anything referred to in this section on behalf or for the benefit of the credit provider.

Prohibited charges

Section 38 of the Consumer Credit Act, 2016 states that-

- (1) A credit provider shall not charge an amount to, or impose a monetary liability on, the consumer in respect of –
- a) A credit fee or charge prohibited by this act;
- b) An amount of a fee or charge exceeding the amount that may be charged consistent with this act;
- c) An interest charged under a credit agreement exceeding the amount that may be charged consistent with this act; or
- d) Any fee, charge, commission, expense or other amount payable by the credit provider to any third party in respect of a credit agreement, except as contemplated in this act.
- (2) A credit provider shall not charge a consumer a price for any goods or services higher than the price charged by that credit provider for the same or

substantially similar goods or services in the ordinary course of business on the basis of a cash transaction.

Unlawful provisions in credit agreements

Much against previous practises in the market, the Consumer Credit Act, 2016 makes it unlawful a provision in a credit agreement if its general purpose or effect is to-

- a) Deceive the consumer or subject the consumer to fraudulent conduct;
- the consumer to fraudulent conduct;
 b) Express an agreement by the consumer to –
- i. Deposit with the credit provider, or with any other person at the direction of the credit provider, an identity document, credit or debit card, bank account or automatic teller machine access card, or any similar identifying document or device; or
- ii. Provide a personal identification code or number to be used to access an account;
- c) Purport to direct or authorise any person engaged in processing payments to give priority to payments for the credit provider over any other credit provider;
- d) Purport to authorise or permit the credit provider to satisfy an obligation of the consumer by making a charge against an asset, account, or amount deposited by or for the benefit of the consumer and held by the credit provider or a third party, except by way of a standing debt arrangement, or to the extent permitted by Section 96 of the

Consumer Credit Act, 2016.

Consumer Rights and obligations-Information and Language

Language and fine print where consumers are supposed to sign has been a very contentious issue for consumers who claim they do not understand what they signed up for or they are rushed into signing. The Authority as per the provisions of the Act encourages consumers to take their time read through the document and ask where they do not understand before signing anything.

Section 29 (1) of the Consumer Credit Act, 2016 states that a credit provider shall offer a consumer an opportunity to choose in which of the two official languages the consumer wishes to exchange that information or provide that document to the consumer accordingly;

- (2) The information or document that is required to be exchanges with or delivered to a consumer in terms of this Act shall be-
- a) The context, comprehensiveness and consistency of the document
- b) The organisation, form and style of the document
- c) The vocabulary, usage and sentence structure of the text; and
- d) The use of any illustrations, examples, headings, or other aids to reading and understanding.
- The obligations of a consumer in relation to credit are;
- a) Apply for credit only from licensed

credit providers (who have a valid credit provision licence for the year in question)

In order to enable credit providers to conduct proper credit assessments, screening and evaluations;

b) The consumer should be honest and answer all questions and requests for information truthfully.

c) Fill in the credit application form in full and in a truthful manner and provide all required information.

Be a responsible credit consumer: a) Do not apply for credit when you

know you cannot pay for it.

b) Read the credit agreement with understanding before signing it and

c) Make sure you receive a receipt every time you repay your loan and keep it safe as you may need it as proof

of payment should there be a need. d) Pay all your debt when it falls due.

e) Approach your credit provider and/or write in case you are unable to honour the terms of your repayment so as to reschedule your loan. Consumers are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the Consumer Credit Act of 2016 in order to be aware of their rights and what is expected of them with regard to credit. Morocco severs ties with Iran

RABAT - Morocco has severed diplomatic ties with Iran over Tehran's support for the Polisario Front, a Western Sahara independence movement, the Moroccan foreign minister said. Morocco has claimed Western Sahara since colonial power Spain left in 1975. But Polisario fought a guerrilla war for independence for the Sahrawi people until a United Nationsbacked ceasefire in 1991, monitored by UN peacekeepers. Foreign Minister Nasser Bourita accused Iran and its Lebanese Shi'ite ally, Hezbollah, of training and arming Polisario fighters via the Iranian embassy in Algeria. Reuters

ZANU-PF fall in primary elections

HARARE - A number of Zimbabwe's ruling ZANU-PF heavyweights have reportedly fallen by the wayside in the party's primary elections. According to New Zimbabwe.com, President Emmerson Mnangagwa's top adviser Christopher Mutsvangwa and ZANU-PF's National Chairperson Oppah Muchinguri were some of those who lost in their constituencies. The report said that unconfirmed results showed that Mutsvangwa was humbled by Langton Mutendreya in Norton while Muchinguri lost to an unknown Joyce Bukuta in her bid to represent Nyanga in the ruling party's women quota. More than 60 killed in Nigeria blasts

NIGERIA -Suicide bombers killed more than 60 people at a mosque and a market in northeast



Nigeria on Tuesday, in a twin attack bearing the hallmarks of Boko Haram and a day after US President Donald Trump pledged greater support to fight the Islamist militants. The blasts, said to have been carried out by young boys, happened shortly after 13:00 (1200 GMT) in Mubi, some 200km from the Adamawa state capital, Yola, Imam Garki, from the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), said a joint assessment with the police and Red Cross found that 26 people were killed and 56 were injured, 11 of them critically. AFP

Cyprus hands Egypt ancient artefacts

CYPRUS - Cyprus has handed back to Egypt 14 ancient artefacts stolen and smuggled abroad in the late 1980s after authorities on the Mediterranean island seized them, Egypt's government said. The artefacts include an alabaster base "decorated with the name of King Ramses II in addition to 13 ushabti figurines and amulets of different shapes," the antiquities ministry said, citing an official. Interpol had informed Egypt of the objects' seizure in 2017, the ministry said. AFP

Chad approves new constitution

N'DJAMENA - Chad's Parliament on Monday overwhelmingly approved a new constitution that expands President Idriss Deby's powers and could allow him to stay in office until 2033, in a vote boycotted by most opposition lawmakers. The new constitution reimposes a two-term limit scrapped in a 2005 referendum. But it will not be applied retroactively, meaning Deby could serve two terms after the next election in 2021. The constitution now heads to Deby for his signature. *Reuters*



'ROBERT MUGABE DID NOTHING WRONG'

HARARE - A party linked to allies of former President Robert Mugabe has threatened to "frustrate" new President Emmerson Mnangagwa's bid to win elections this year, independent reports say.

The National Patriotic Front (NPF) has held well-attended provincial meetings in Midlands, Masvingo and Bulawayo in recent days.

"We will spoil the meal for ZANU-PF. We know how to frustrate Mnangagwa," top NPF official Jeppy Jaboon told a meeting in Masvingo on Friday.

"This time, Mnangagwa will not make it to the presidency," he was quoted as saying by the private Standard newspaper.

"What we want is to remove the coup government and replace it with a civilian government," he added.

Former Cabinet minister Ambrose Mutinhiri left ZANU-PF earlier this year to head the



new party, which allegedly has links to a former ruling party faction loyal to Grace Mugabe.

Jaboon said an alliance with the Movement for Democratic Change and other opposition parties might be on the cards because "they are no longer our enemies".

He said Mugabe, who was forced to step down after a military takeover in November, had done nothing wrong. "What did Mugabe do wrong? He gave us land, and look what Mnangagwa is doing. He is giving back that land to the whites," Jaboon said.

Mnangagwa has ruled out reversing the 18-year-old land reform programme, but his government has ordered an end to illegal land occupations and offered longer leases to the few white farmers still on the land.

Gabon's government steps down after election delays

LIBREVILLE - Gabon's government resigned on Tuesday, the day after the Constitutional Court dissolved the national Parliament and also called for the country's leadership to step down over election delays.

Prime Minister Emmanuel Issoze Ngondet "submitted the resignation letter of his government following the decision of the Constitutional Court to put an end to the powers of the current Legislature, resulting in the resignation of the current government," a statement

said.

According to the court, the government should have organised twice-delayed elections by April 30 at the latest.

The powers of the disbanded National Assembly will be transferred to the upper house Senate until elections are held, the court added. A date for the ballot is yet to be announced.

President Ali Bongo's re-election in 2016 led to opposition accusations of electoral fraud.

Violence broke out days after the vote, and opposition figures say more than 50 people ruption. AFP

were killed in clashes. The official toll was only three dead.

Bongo took over power from his father Omar Bongo, who had ruled for 41 years until his death in 2009.

Gabon has large oil, mineral and tropical timber resources, and its per-capita national income is four times greater than that of most sub-Saharan nations.

But about a third of its population of 1.8 million still live below the poverty line -- the result, say experts, of inequality, poor governance and corruption. *AFP*

Angola looks beyond crude oil to fish oil

BENGUELA - Angolan President Joao Lourenco has named diversifying the oildependent economy as his top priority after he became the country's first new leader in 38 years.

And one natural and readily available resource that has been identified is fish—but a lack of equipment and know-how has meant the industry has struggled.

Lourenco, part of the MPLA party that has ruled Angola since 1975, took office in September promising to deliver an "economic miracle" that would transform the southern African nation, where the UN says more than half of the population lives on less than \$2 a day.

The collapse in 2014 of the price of crude oil, which provides 70 per cent of all revenues and nearly all hard currency, put immense pressure on the country to diversify.

Even though global oil prices have since recovered somewhat, Lourenco still plans to push forward.

He is betting the 1 600 kilometres (1 000 miles) of Atlantic coast could provide a fishing bonanza.

Relaunch

"The diversification of the economy is our priority," Lourenco said recently. "We're going to relaunch fishing and agriculture and we will open the country to foreign investment."

To demonstrate his commitment, Lourenco visited fish factories in Tombwa on the southwest coast.

One of the sites is equipped to freeze the catch, while the other processes fish into oil and fishmeal

Fish oil is highly sought after by the cosmetics and pharmaceutical industries, while fishmeal is used by farmers as animal feed.

Lourenco vowed to "improve the infrastructure to support fishing and the transformation of processing", according to the government's latest six-year plan.

Fishing Minister Victoria de Barros previously announced plans to build a new port with refrigerated storage in Tombwa at a cost of \$23.5 million. *AFP*

ICC prosecutor in DRC to probe alleged crimes against humanity

KINSHASA - The International Criminal Court's chief prosecutor arrived in Kinshasa, the ICC said, following requests to investigate deadly violence in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Prosecutor Fatou Bensouda is due to meet with government officials and judicial institutions and hold a press conference today, the court said.

In January, a European Parliament resolution urged "the ICC and the UN to investigate allegations of crimes against humanity in Kasai in the centre of the Democratic Republic of Congo."

On March 1, the Congolese citizen movement Debout (Arise) also asked the ICC to investigate the



crackdown on peaceful protests.

16 people have been killed since December 31 as three marches, organised by the Catholic Church, were met with deadly force. The marchers called on President Joseph Kabila to declare publicly that he would step down.

Kabila, in power since 2001, refused to leave office when his term expired

in December 2016.

Elections, twice delayed, are due to be held on December 23, but opposition groups say they have little hope that the vote will be fair and credible.

Banned

Public rallies have been banned since September 2016, when dozens of demonstrators were killed.

Last year, at least 47 people were killed, according to a UN report seen by AFP last month.

Set up in 2002 in The Hague, the ICC is the world's only permanent war crimes court and acts to prosecute the worst abuses, including genocide in places where national tribunals are unwilling or unable to act. *AFP*



ANC 'very concerned' over salary disparities between workers, executives

PRETORIA - Deputy President David Mabuza on Tuesday said South Africa's governing African National Congress (ANC) was deeply concerned about the major imbalances between the incomes of workers in South Africa in comparison with those who occupy executive positions.

"The ANC is very concerned about the disparity between incomes of executives and incomes of workers. We are adamant that this issue must be addressed as soon as possible as we must not perpetuate a situation where those at the top continue to live in utmost luxury whilst the working class continues to languish in poverty," Mabuza said at a Workers Day commemoration in the KwaZulu-Natal province. "On this May Day, we are also here to tell the bosses of our vast land to sit back, see, feel and care for the plight of their workers; to call for a sense of shared humanity, to tame our relentless pursuit of wealth and obscene profits in a sea of poverty." He called on employers to treasure their employees and to realise that they are men and women seeking an honest living through hard work. "These are



people who work hard but struggle to see real progress. They are South Africans who wish to wake up every morning with the pride and dignity of pulling themselves up by their boot straps. They are compatriots who want to do an honest day's work," said Mabuza. "These are men and women of immense faith. They want to have something to show for their daily toil. And so they pray to leave a proud legacy for their children." The deputy president also appealed to employ-

ers and companies to heighten safety within the workplaces.

"South African workers deserve employers who will guarantee their safety in the workplace, employers that will assure families that workers will return home well and wholesome. We yearn for more caring and ethical employers who are invested in their workers returning home tall with their bodily integrity and not cold in a coffin," he said.

COSATU is not independent from the ANC - Zwelinzima

JOHANNEBSURG - The South African Federation of Trade Union's (SAFTU) general secretary Zwelinzima Vavi has said that COSATU was not independent of the ANC.

He was speaking to eNCA after addressing a May Day rally in Port Elizabeth on Tuesday.

"Independence is the name. Can they claim to be independent of the ANC? No, they can't," he said.

He said COSATU must not allow itself "to be pulled by the nose" by any political party.

"Unions must be truly democratic. Unions must be fighting and must not be sweethearts. They must be campaigning, must be based on the militant unity of workers. They mustn't agree to hand over the working people to be further exploited by their class enemies. If COSATU was to embrace those principles, we will unite tomorrow," he said.

He said unity was the way to go "but principled unity".

"Unity on the basis that the trade union movement must be independent. Unions must speak politics of the country. They must speak about issues that affect workers in the workplaces and in the communities," Vavi said.

During his address, Vavi said they were not going to "back down" in their fight against the newly announce R20 minimum wage.

"A new struggle has begun. Maqabane, (Comrades) a new revolution is underway. If you don't understand the nature of that revolution you're going to be caught up in the confusion," he said.

He said SAFTU was in the struggle to liberate black people that continue to be trapped in poverty and inequality. "And that continues to be the public face of inequality in our society, and we are not going to back down because we understand that that struggle is not just a struggle to the total emancipation of our black people but the struggle for the total emancipation of the working class in our country," he said. Speaking at another May Day rally at the Vaal in Gauteng, ANC's secretary general Ace Magashule said the collective leadership of the ANC, under the leadership of President Cyril Ramaphosa, was committed towards the unity and cohesion of "our revolutionary alliance". Leader Mmusi places a muzzle on his 'amateurs'

CAPE TOWN - DA leader Mmusi Maimane has read his councillors in Cape Town the riot act and effectively gagged them from speaking to the media or posting on social media - especially about mayor Patricia de Lille.

In a letter dated April 26, Maimane wrote that he has become increasingly concerned and frustrated at the "frankly amateurish" way in which the members of the City of Cape Town caucus are conducting themselves.

"While the developments surrounding the mayor are understandably unsettling and provoke emotional responses, this cannot stand in the way of your duty to run the City effectively and to deliver proper services to the people of Cape Town.

"Some members of the caucus seem to think that they are entitled to ventilate their opinion openly to the media and/or via social media - on matters that relate to caucus discussions or on how the City is being administered," states Maimane in his letter.

"There is now a bizarre situation where the party's political authority for Cape Town (the metro region) has openly rejected the City's budget.

Workers dump Sdumo Dlamini during his May Day address

PORT ELIZABETH - Several hundred workers walked out on Cosatu president Sdumo Dlamini as he delivered his Workers' Day speech on the national minimum wage.

According to a Business Day report, workers left the Isaac Wolfson Stadium in Kwazakhele, near Port Elizabeth, as Dlamini delivered his keynote address.

The report said Dlamini was unfazed by the walkout. According to a report by the African News Agency, carried in The Citizen, Dlamini told the crowd that those who were leaving could do so since the issues he wanted to discuss had already been raised by previous speakers. Dlamini has been mired in controversy after allegations emerged that he received a R300 000 bribe.

According to City Press, the Hawks are investigating whether convicted child molester Deon Larry paid Dlamini the bribe, as well as whether former president Jacob Zuma was paid R1m to keep Senzeni Zokwana in his Cabinet.

Cosatu was vociferous in its call to remove Zuma as president. News24

Nationwide bus strike drags on

JOHANNESBURG – There will be no buses again for thousands of South Africans across the country on Wednesday as a nationwide strike drags on.

A deal between striking drivers and employers has yet to be reached.

The strike has entered its third week. This is despite calls from government for unions and employers to find a solution.

Bus companies are offering an

eight percent salary increase for the first year and 8.5 eight percent for the second year.

Workers are demanding a 9.5 percent hike. They also want night shift allowances and medical aid.

Trade union federation, Saftu, is calling for an end to the strike, saying the public should put pressure on employers.

"If there is any treatment that helps improve my skin condition by 50 per cent, it will give my confidence a boost."

Shalini was treated for free at Regional University Hospital and Virgen de la Victoria of Malaga after she was helped by the Indiabased press agency Newslions, when its owner Sanjay Pandey heard about her plight.

Vedika's father said: "I have spoken with the father of Shalini Yadav.

Their mother Madhuri Gupta, 45, said: "My elder daughter, who also has the same skin disorder, keeps herself confined in her room.

"She is now a grown woman con-

scious about her looks and appearance. Hence, she avoids socialising, interacting with people or even coming in front of the camera."

After conventional treatment failed to ease the sisters' symptoms, they turned to homeopathic remedies, which only made their disorder worse.

Madhuri said: "It aggravated the condition. "It became so bad that the girls would have constant itching and occasional bleeding from the skin cracks."

4 Turkish opposition parties agres election alliance deal

NKARA - Turkey's main opposition Republican People's Party (CHP) and three other opposition parties have reached a deal on an alliance for snap parliamentary elections on 24 June, a CHP official said yesterday.

The official, who declined to be identified, told Reuters the deal between the CHP, the fledgeling Iyi (Good) Party, the Islamist Saadet Party and the Democrat Party would be formally announced at a news conference today.

It will enable the smaller parties in the alliance to skirt a regulation that mandates parties must receive at least 10 per cent of the vote to enter Parliament. The deal creates a broad coalition against President

Tayyip Erdogan's ruling alliance. Erdogan's ruling AK Party has established an alliance with the

Nationalist Movement Party (MHP). Broadcaster NTV said the opposition alliance deal would be signed at 3 pm (1200 GMT) today. A deadline of May 6 was set for election alliances to be filed with the High Election Board.

Erdogan has won nearly a dozen elections and dominated Turkish politics since his Islamist-rooted AK party first swept to power in 2002. The elections will mark Turkey's transition to a presidency with new sweeping executive powers, agreed under a narrowly approved referendum last year.

Duterte order disappoints protesters

MANILA - Philippine labour groups expressed disappointment yesterday over a long-awaited executive order by President Rodrigo Duterte to crack down on short-term hiring, saying it offered nothing new and left millions of workers without benefits.

Halting use of short contracts commonly referred to as 'endo', or 'end of contract,' because they offer few or no benefits, was one of the populist campaign promises that put Duterte in office, but workers' groups say he has dragged his heels on the issue.

Thousands marched on Labour Day on Tuesday to demand that Duterte issue an executive order, but the one he announced fell short of expectations. It promised to enforce an existing ban on illegal contracting and subtracting, and tasked lawmakers to come up with a new labour code. Entitled

"There is nothing new in favour of the workers," said Elmer Labog, Head of the Kilusang Mayo Uno (1 May Movement),

a leftwing workers group.

"With this signal from the president, we are left without hope that the new legislation on labour will be favourable for us."

Employers who practice 'endo' offer tenures shorter than six months, the threshold at which a worker must be made permanent, and entitled to benefits.

Carlos Isagani Zarate, a representative of the Bayan Muna or 'Country First' congressional party, said it was likely that big labour federations would outright reject Duterte's order.

Death toll up to 7 after Swiss Alps storm

SWEDEN - A fifth person has died after a group of 14 skiers were caught up in a storm, police said on Tuesday, after the bodies of two climbers were also found elsewhere in the Swiss Alps.

"Late in the evening on April 30, a fifth victim died," police in Valais canton said in a statement.

Bad weather in the Pigne d'Arolla area of the Swiss Alps on Sunday had caught the group of skiers by surprise.

The group had set out from the Dix rest-stop and had intended to make it to Vignettes to called The Serpentine.

The manager of a rest-stop in the remote mountain region sent out a call for help at dawn on Monday, triggering a major relief operation that involved seven helicopters, police said.

One person was found dead on the scene, and was believed to have died in a fall.

Three others died soon after they reached hospital, followed by the fifth death late on Monday.

That person was likely among the five initially listed in critical condition by police.

Others in the group were mere-

sleep, trekking along a route ly suffering from "mild hypother-

The victims were Italian, French and German nationals, police said, adding that efforts were underway to formally identify them.

All the families had been informed of the tragedy, police said.

Police said separately that the bodies of two climbers, aged 21 and 22, were found further east on Monday, in the Alps in Bern canton, after the alert was sounded but the bad weather foiled rescue efforts.

Macron reiterates need to keep Iran nuclear deal

SYDNEY - French leader **Emmanuel Macron yesterday** reiterated his commitment to the Iran nuclear deal, saying no one wants an escalation of tensions in the region while admitting the accord needed strengthening.

US President Donald Trump is threatening to pull out of the agreement - negotiated in 2015 between Tehran and six world powers, by the May 12 deadline - for Washington to renew its support for the deal.

The agreement imposes strict restrictions on Iran's nuclear programme in return for the loosening of economic sanctions. Macron, who met Trump in Washington last week to try to convince him to not walk away, admitted he still did not know what decision the US leader

would take. "I don't know what the US president will decide on May 12," he said during a twoday visit to Sydney, speaking alongside Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull. "I just want to say whatever the

decision will be, we will have to prepare such a broader negotiation and a broader deal, because I think nobody wants a war in the region, and nobody wants an escalation in terms of tension in the region."

Trump has pilloried the agreement designed to curb Iran's nuclear programme as "insane' and "ridiculous" and called for fresh measures to counter Iran's ballistic missile programme and support for militant groups across the Middle East.

Macron, who admitted in Sydney that the existing deal was "not sufficient," is pushing for international talks on a potential wider accord.

Speaking in English, he said there needed to be three additional "pillars" in the agreement.

The Times reports that the questions from Robert Mueller's team cover Trump's motivations for firing FBI Director James Comey and contacts Trump's campaign had with Russians as well as other matters. The Times reports that it obtained a list of the questions. AP

Abuse scandal haunts Catholic cleric

AUSTRALIA -From country priest to trusted top Vatican aide, Australia's most senior Catholic cleric George Pell has seen his reputation plagued in the twilight of his



career by controversy swirling around a 1970s paedophile scandal in the former gold rush town of Ballarat.

To his admirers, the 76-year-old cardinal embodies the orthodox traditions of Australian Catholicism, but to his critics he represents an institution that has failed to properly deal with sex abuse allegations. AFP

Iran calls Netanyahu infamous liar

IRAN - Iran branded Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu an "infamous liar" over his allegations of a secret Iranian nuclear weapons programme.

Netanyahu's comments came from a "broke and infamous liar who has had nothing to offer except lies and deceits," foreign ministry spokesperson Bahram Ghasemi said in a statement.

SEOUL - South Korean President Moon Jae-in yesterday dismissed claims that US troops stationed in the country would have to leave if a peace treaty was signed with the

Seoul and Pyongyang have remained technically at war since the 1950s but Moon and North Korean leader Kim Jong-un agreed at a landmark summit last week to work towards a permanent treaty to replace a 65-year-old armistice agreement. "US Forces Korea (USFK) is a matter of the South Korea-US alliance.

"It has nothing to do with signing a peace treaty," Moon said, referring to the agreement that sees 28 500 US forces based in the South.





Some of them were more concerned with the Best Composer category won by Mathokoza Sibiya, though he had only one vote.


In this category, Nondumiso Nhleko was leading with 3 023 votes followed by Symphony with 1 621, Sands with nine and Siyabonga Sukati with four.

"I'm the busiest and most visible, anyone can agree with me. If the CV, plus votes, plus work and all were considered, then it makes no sense how I didn't take that award home.


I was personally told we are looking at CVs, work quality, votes and person's visibility.

Dlamini mentioned that the work done by the artists should speak as not only



FIFA TO WEIGH UP STAGING NEW MINI-WORLD CUP

ZURICH, Switzerland - FIFA president Gianni Infantino has proposed staging what would effectively be a mini-World Cup, featuring eight international teams, every two years in addition to the traditional event.

The tournament, known as the "Final 8", would be the climax of a proposed global Nations League competition, part of an ambitious plan to reform international football which FIFA believes could be worth \$25 billion in a 12-year cycle.

In a letter seen by Reuters, Infantino, who has already overseen the enlargement of the existing World Cup from 32 to 48 teams starting in 2026, suggested that the new tournament would take place every October and/or November of every odd year starting from 2021.

He said that a "solid and serious" group of investors were willing to spend \$25 billion on the competi-

tion and a revamped version of the Club World Cup, which would also start in 2021 with 24 teams.

The Confederations Cup, currently staged every four years before the World Cup, would be abolished.

The letter did not clearly indicate how many slots would be allocated to each region.

The plans were sent by Infantino to the members of FIFA's decision-making Council which still has to approve them.

The new competition would run parallel to existing international tournaments such as the European Championship, Copa America, and African Nations Cup, plus the World Cup qualifying stages.

It could lead to criticism that FIFA is over-complicating international football and devaluing its flagship World Cup.

Sundowns have buried the possibility of this happening as far as the title race is concerned by cementing a record league championship success in the PSL era with a seven-point advantage over Pirates, who went down 1-0 to Cape Town City last Saturday, even before the final round of fixtures.

Relegation-threatened Ajax staged an impressive revival during Ndoro's seven appearances with a number of invaluable victories, including one over erstwhile title challengers Pirates.

But after issuing Ndoro with a player's ticket and the League's Dispute Resolution Committee confirming his registration and right to play for Ajax, the PSL itself remarkably over-turned the decision in mid-stream and ruled Ndoro could not represent the Cape

Town club this season in accordance with a FIFA rule that stipulates a player cannot feature in the colours of three different clubs in a season.

The decision of the PSL executive was akin to the organisation deciding a winning goal in a game was converted from the penalty spot the referee should not have awarded - and thereby over-turning the result of the game.

And, what has come into question, is whether self-interest had been an over-riding factor in the executive's somersault verdict.

What has happened since is a series of appeals to SAFA, an arbitration ruling, an appeal to FIFA for guidance and court actions that have left the outcome of what has been labelled an administrative debacle still undecid-

ed - and now apparently back in the hands of another arbitration decision after relegation-threatened Ajax's appeal to field Ndoro in the fateful run-in to the Absa Premiership championship was turned down last week by a Johannesburg court judge.

"I believe it would be totally incomprehensible and an injustice if we are deprived of any of the hard-earned points we gained in the games in which Ndoro played," says seasoned Ajax coach Muhsin Ertugral, "but we have, in any case, already been damaged by the PSL's decision to reverse their original ruling regarding the player."

Fortunately, however, the Ndoro case, no matter how it is concluded, cannot now decide the destination of the League title.

MADRID- Real Madrid left back Marcelo admitted he was fortunate not to concede a penalty during their 2-2 draw with Bayern Munich at the Bernabeu, a let-off that helped the holders reach the Champions League final 4-3 on aggregate on Tuesday.

The Brazilian defender blocked a shot from Joshua Kimmich in the penalty area at the end of the first half with the score at 1-1 but Turkish referee Cuneyt Cakir gave a corner.

Kimmich had given Bayern the lead but Karim Benzema soon cancelled the goal out and the Frenchman put Madrid 2-1 up just after the break following a clanger from keeper Sven Ulreich.

The goal meant Bayern had to score two more goals to knock Real out and they only managed one, from James Rodriguez.

The 22-year-old defender was quickly blooded into the first team after joining from Bolton in 2016, making his debut in the 4-3 defeat to Liverpool on the opening day of the Premier League campaign. Holding went on to feature 18 times for Wenger's side in his debut season at the Emirates Stadium, which he capped off in style with a start in the 2-1 FA Cup final win over Chelsea. The former England Under-21 international has been given more game time this term, but remained firmly behind Laurent Koscielny and Shkodran Mustafi in the pecking order at the back. However, the Gunners clearly expect the Trotters youth product to have a bright future and have tied him down beyond 2020, when his previous deal would have expired." Sport24

Chelsea set to meet £31m release clause for Henrichs

LONDON - Chelsea are ready to meet a £31million release clause to sign Bayer Leverkusen defender Benjamin Henrichs. The Germany international, 21, is one of the most highly-rated young full-backs in the Bundesliga and has a contract at Leverkusen stretching until 2022. But in that deal, there is a £31m exit clause and according to The Sun, Chelsea are willing to stump up the cash to bring him to Stamford Bridge this summer. Everton have picked up 33 points from 22 games under Allardyce but there has been growing discontent among some fans over the quality of foot-


ball on display.

LONDON - Southampton's win over Bournemouth on Saturday has given the dressing room a lift ahead of their final three matches of the Premier League season, midfielder Oriol Romeu has said.

After a run of four straight defeats plunged Southampton deep into relegation trouble, Mark Hughes' side have taken four points from their last two games following a 0-0 draw at Leicester City and a 2-1 win over Bournemouth.

Southampton are a point from safety with games against Everton, Swansea City and Manchester City rounding out the season.

"You were going home after losing or drawing a game and thinking, 'What do we have to do and when will we win a game?' It was never our day," Romeu told Daily Echo.

"We are going to feel relaxed but we need to prepare for the next game because it does not give you too long to rest. The next one will be as important as this one so we have to go again." Romeu said six points might be enough to guarantee survival.

"It is difficult to tell. Hopefully two wins will do," the 26-year-old Spaniard added. "The other opponents have difficult games coming and it is not going to be easy for them."

Another ex-Real Madrid star Raul is fourth behind Casillas, Ronaldo and Xavi with 142 appearances while former Manchester United winger Ryan Giggs (141) is in fifth









Physical Fitness Performance Device for FA

 Device will ensure improved performance of players, reduce injuries, decrease sudden cardiac arrest cases and reduce fatalities

SOCCER-THE National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) is amongst some member countries to receive Physical Fitness Performance devices used to monitor the performance of athletes.

Information gathered from the CAF website is that the objective of the donation is to protect African football players and will lead to improved performance of players, reduce injuries, decrease sudden cardiac arrest cases and reduce fatalities, amongst other things, towards the development of football across the continent. Following a decision of the CAF executive committee on 10 January in Casablanca, Morocco, each of the member associations will receive the divices from this month.

"A milestone gesture in the history of football development in the African continent, CAF thus becomes the first continental confederation to sponsor their members with the best and latest technology to develop and protect their talents. "The device is a strategy and physical performance measuring tool for outdoor team sports players. It is a stand-alone tool worn by players on the chest (vest) to collect data, which are synchronised at the end of a game or training on a laptop or mobile device, reads part of the statement. NFAS Marketing and Communications Officer Muzi Radebe said they were aware of the developments, adding that this device would go a long way in the development of local football. "This is a good initiative by CAF and we are positive that it will greatly improve the performance of our players," he said. Each member association will receive 50 kits consisting of 25 physical fitness devices, 25 heart rate monitors, three charging hubs, 50 vests, one carry bag, antenna for live data and a specific laptop, which can be used by more than one national team at the same time.

Ex- Liverpool star for Bible Society Cup

SOCCER - FORMER Liverpool forward Howard Gayle will be in the country later this month for the unveiling of the Bible Society Cup trophy.

The team's General Manager Sandile 'Beyond' Zwane confirmed the matter yesterday during the team's farewell at the Prince of Wales Ground.

The reports states that the stadium was now a sore sight because of the dilapidate state it is currently in.



"The dressing rooms are also a risk to players with no roof and hanging electricity cables. The stadium needs serious attention before hosting international games.

The ministry needs an extra budget to start the rehabilitation in time," reads part of the report.

The budget is exclusive to the E4 million allocated towards the upgrading of the flood
