THE Swaziland Nursing Association (SNA) won round one in its legal battle against the government where it is fighting the latter's decision to prevent Sibusiso Lushaba from representing the union in cost of living negotiations.

Lushaba is the Secretary General of the union and in a meeting between the union and the Government Negotiating Team (GNT) held on March 7, 2018, the GNT objected to Lushaba's presence and refused to proceed with the meeting.

**Opposed** 

Government, through the ministry of public service, opposed the application and raised three points in limine (preliminary points).

The first point was based on urgency. Government argued that the matter was not urgent within the contemplation of Rule 15. It further argued that the Industrial Court has no jurisdiction to over the matter. It was further submitted by government that the union did not have *locus standi* (legal standing) to bring the application. It contended that the union did not possess the requisite substantial interest in the exclusion of Sibusiso Lushaba from the bargaining table as to chal-

lenge same. "It is Mr Lushaba himself who has such interest. The union has representatives more than Mr Lushaba. It is submitted that the recognition agreement allows the applicant (union) a number of representatives to adequately represent it," submitted government. In a ruling delivered yesterday, Industrial Court President Sifiso Nsibande dismissed government's preliminary points. "It is trite that an applicant will have *locus standi in judicio* if the right on which he basis

his claim is on that he personally enjoys. or if he has a sufficient interest in the person or persons whose right he seeks to protect and it is improbable or impractical for those persons to approach the court themselves. In this matter, it is clear that the union seeks to protect its right to be represented by a person of its choice in the bargaining process. The union, it appears to us, is seeking to protect its own interests. The ruling given by the court will affect the union and not Mr Lushaba personal. ly. He sits in the bargaining process not in his personally capacity looking for his personal interest but on behalf of the union looking after the interest of the union and by extension, its members," remarked the judge. The count further ordered that the matter proceeds to the merits.

# 'I am HIV positive Your Majesty'

EMASWATI seized the opportunity on Tuesday when they came face-to-face with His Majesty King Mswati III during the gift presentation ceremony at Lozitha Palace.

One Sakhile Mhlongo had the whole auditorium in dead silence when she narrated her ordeal to the King.

Mhlongo, a widow to Mnikwa Mhlongo who spent his whole life serving Their Majesties from the late King Sobhuza II and King Mswati III before he met his death, said she was living a horrifying life and had been barred from seeing Their Majesties to present her case.

"Your Majesty I am happy to get this opportunity. First and foremost, I would like to wish you a happy birthday and a long life. I am also happy that I got this opportunity to address you. Your Majesty I am suffering. My son was fired from the army under controversial circumstances and I have no one to look after me," she said.

Mhlongo said because her son had been fired she was suffering and was subjected to poverty yet she is HIV positive.

"I am on Anti-Retroviral treatment (ARVs). There are nights I go to bed on porridge only because I have nothing," she said. She said because the King was her father, she had come to him with the hope that he would help her. The whole time Mhlongo addressed him, His Majesty listened with keen interest. Others also seized the moment and asked His Majesty to support their businesses.

# King humbled by nation's support

HIS Majesty King Mswati III was humbled by the overwhelming support from Emaswati during the 50/50 celebrations.

Making his remarks after the gifts presentation ceremony which started at 6pm on Monday until midnight, His Majesty said the 50/50 celebrations were successful because Emaswati had made contributions.

His Majesty, who was all smiles and stood through the six-hour event, said the turn-out was the first of its kind and he was amazed that Emaswati had raised over E15 million on their own.

"These donations are a first of its kind, Emaswati were able to contribute over E15 million. This is pleasing and shows that very soon we will be to raise E100 million on our own for whatever project," he said

He said the turn-out by the nation showed that the country was well on track to attaining the vision to be a first world by 2022 and this spoke volumes to the current state of the economy.

of women by their lovers in the country, the courts are also coming to the party by issuing severe sentences against offenders.

A teacher from Sigangeni High School was yesterday sentenced to 10 years without an option of a fine for the gruesome killing of his girlfriend and mother of his child.

Sifiso Mathambo Vilakati (42) killed his lover Nqobile Fakudze by stabbing her 13 times using a knife on January 28, 2006 at KaQobonga bar in Sidwashini in Mbabane. According to the statement of agreed facts that was prepared and filed in court yesterday, Mathambo and the deceased had been lovers since 2000 and were staying together in a rented flat in Ntabamhlophe. They later stayed at Sigangeni High School where Mathambo was a teacher and then moved to Vilakati's parental homestead in Mpolonjeni before the deceased left in December 2005 to live with her uncle at Ngwenya.

It is said that on the fateful day, the deceased approached Vilakati at around 10pm while he was standing outside the Qobonga bar. She told him to stop harassing her and further informed him that their nine-year-old boy was

supposedly not his.

'In fact, the deceased had taken away the child to live with the deceased's mother in the Republic of South Africa but before then the child had lived with the accused since he was born. The deceased further informed the accused that she miscarried in 2003 and that even that child was not for the accused. After hearing all the stories about the two children, the accused got angry hence stabbing the deceased several times with a knife," reads the statement. The bar was about to close and most patrons were outside when the incident unfolded.

Vilakati then gave his cell phone

to one Sibhikibhiki to call the police and the deceased was taken into a van and transported to hospital.

"Indeed deceased was taken to hospital where she

died on January 29. After committing the offence, the accused spent the night at Thembelihle and proceeded the following day to his parental home at Mpolonjeni to tell his father about the incident. He then called his attorney who then surrendered him to the police. The police failed to find the knife which was used by the accused when commit-

ting the offence. The accused says he is very remorseful about what happened on the day as he had not intended to kill his girlfriend," reads the statement.

According to a post mortem report compiled by police

pathologist Dr Koma Reddy, the cause of death was multiple stab wounds.

Twelve years later, Vilakati finally had his day in court yesterday and pleaded guilty to culpable homicide. Through his lawyer Mandla Mkhwanazi, he informed the court

that he regretted everything that happened. He said the deceased provoked him and he acted in the spur of the moment. He also asked the court to consider granting him an option of a fine in meting out the sentence. However, Senior Crown Counsel Macebo Nxumalo vehemently objected to the granting of the fine.

He submitted that Vilakati committed a barbaric act on a defenseless woman and further implored the court to pass a stiff sentence which would serve as a deterrence to would be offenders.

Justice Nkululeko Hlophe sentenced Vilakati to ten years imprisonment. However, three years of the sentence was suspended on condition he does not commit another offence in which violence is involved. Vilakati will effectively serve seven years behind bars.

# Rate payers want Gideon Mhlongo gone

MBABANE residents want under fire City Council Chief Executive Office Gideon Mhlongo out of office by July

This transpired at a press conference held at the Mbabane *Inkhundla* yesterday. The residents were gathered to brief the media on a big meeting scheduled for this coming Saturday at the MDS High School hall.

The residents said they understood that Mhlongo had been cleared from the alleged move to dissolve council where he was to invoke a particular clause within the Urban Government Act.

## Suspended

Mhlongo was reportedly suspended while trying to allegedly invoke Section 27 of the Urban Government Act and suspend councilors.

Despite being cleared, the residents passed a vote of no confidence on Mhlongo and encouraged the council not to renew his contract when it expires at the end of

Inly

Council had also indicated at a press briefing two Fridays ago that it would not renew the contract of the CEO that comes to an end in July. This was despite dropping all charges against him.

Mhlongo is blamed for introducing policies that the rate payers association deemed against development initiatives in the city.

They alleged that the residents have to seek permission from the municipality to construct or renovate houses. The residents said everything that was done by the council contradicted some of the clauses in the Constitution.

## Rates

"Mhlongo is running the Mbabane City Council as his farm. For example senior citizens are forced to vacate their homes after failure to pay rates," they alleged. They stated that the council only develops the infrastructure in town rather than helping the destitute people of the city. They also complained about the high rates they pay in the city.

"In Mbabane we pay 15 per cent plus 1.25 per cent and this is higher than infla-

tion," they alleged.

They also alleged that the Urban Government Act is old and no longer corresponds with the country's Constitution.

The CEO was served with the letter of his suspension on May 1 by council.

However, the CEO said he did not understand why exactly he had been suspended.

Mhlongo was back at work on May 29 after his suspension was lifted by council. He is expected to be at the helm of the local authority until his contract expires on July 31 as it has been reported previously.

## Questions

When contacted for comment, City Council Public Relations Officer Lucky Tsabedze acknowledged receiving the set of questions from this publication. However, he said he was not given sufficient time to consult on these matters and allegations raised by the rate payers at the press conference.

"We received the questionnaire very late to allow us proper consultations," he said further stating that they would respond fully today.

# ...Blame minister for interference

Mbabane residents accuse Minister of Housing Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza of interfering with the running of the city.

During the press conference yesterday, the residents voiced out that it was not Mabuza's duty to hire and suspend the CEO but the responsibility of the mayor and the council.

"Section 23 to 25 of the Constitution clearly states that it is the council's jurisdiction to hire and suspend a CEO of a municipality," they said. They therefore feel the minister was not suppose to interfere with the matter since the mayor who is suppose to be above the CEO will give him a report on what the councilors have resolved. "It seems the minister is supporting the CEO who is admin-

istering the city council as his own farm." They further insinuated that the minister might be gaining something from all this.

Residents complained of the conditions that the people of Mbabane have been living under all because of Mhlongo.

"We will complain until the ministry of housing hears us and the Constitution is observed," said the residents. When sought for comment on the matter, Minister Mabuza said these were mere accusations of which the residents have no tangible evidence to back.

"The residents have nothing tangible to back their accusations, I have nothing further to say," said the minister.

# Ward committee policy clashes with traditional structures

THE Local Community and Ward Committee policy which was approved by the council in 2015 is said to be interfering with the structures of the traditional leaders that were appointed by His Majesty King Mswati III in all communities of the country.

The Local Community Committee (LCC) refers to the committees chosen within a ward in formal areas, where there is no Zonal leadership and bandlancane. This policy allows for the setting up of structures that would work with councillors in the different communities.

In the initial phase, the policy allowed community members to elect committee members to work with the councillors,

# Interfering

This happens in both the formal and informal areas. The residents have applauded Cabinet ministers and members of Parliament for making it clear that the LCC policy now interfers with the traditional leaders.

"The LCC policy is now giving powers to the councilors.

The elected councilors had powers to licence guns to local people, which is

something that is only done by a traditional leader," they alleged.

The allegations also implied that the LCC policy works in favour of Mhlongo whom residents accused of managing the city like his own farm.

"Sadly the LCC was introduced by him in 2015 after brainwashing the councilors of that time," they said.

They said the big meeting to be held this coming Saturday will address all these issues.

"We want our people to know what is currently going on and we want their views on the current issues," they said.



# Mom murdered by son with pickaxe cried for help

QUESTIONS have been asked if Beauty Khumalo, the woman who was murdered by her son with a pickaxe, would still be alive if her text messages crying for help were taken seriously.

These are the questions which residents of Dvudvusini are asking themselves after Khumalo was murdered with a pick-axe by her own son over the weekend.

This is because the deceased had sent a text message last Friday night to a resident who is chairman of development projects in the area, Uriah Mabuza.

The deceased is said to have sent a text message telling Mabuza that her son, Musa Khumalo had gone crazy and had not received help for almost a week. The deceased informed Mabuza that Musa had vandalised windows to her house and police were nowhere to be seen.

Mabuza, who was visited yesterday, confirmed that the deceased had been calling him whenever she was in trouble as Musa kept harassing her from time to time. He said whenever they called the police, they would come around and take Musa away and later release him.

He said they would always be asked by the police what Musa had done wrong. He said the community was about to take the law into its own hands and he added that there were fears that should

the accused be released the worse might happen.

Mabuza said officers must make sure that the accused is kept where he belongs until he is fully rehabilitated. He said the community of Dvudvusini has lost a very productive member who was always at the forefront when it came to community development projects.

He said Khumalo (deceased) was the one who made sure that rural development projects were carried out in the area. To mention just a few, Mabuza said Khumalo had been responsible for the Dip Tank Project which has taken place in the area and the rehabilitation of Dvudvusini High. He said the deceased was also vocal even in church.

He said as a community they were really at a loss. Mabuza said they have even made means to ensure that they get outside help by writing to the Human Rights Commission.

He said this was because there have been a lot of gruesome murders in Mankayane which have been taken lightly. He said, for example, in the same area in the past, it was reported that there was a man who killed another and ate him. He said in the recent murder incident, what was even more shocking was that the accused even listed a number of homesteads which he was going to attack.

Musa, who has since been arrested for the murder of his own mother, appeared at the Manzini Magistrate's Court yesterday. The accused, who was in shackles, made a brief court appearance in the company of police officers. After he appeared in court, the accused was taken back to police custody.

# Forbes listed Liswati rejected by own country

PHIWA Nkambule, the first Liswati to make it into Forbes list, was rejected by his own country before he crossed the borders to neighbouring South Africa.

Nkambule was first rejected by Manzini Library, where he had gone to present a proposal for an idea of an online library system. He was later rejected by the Manzini branch of the Regional Education Office (REO), which also did not give a response to him.

In 2013, he approached Manzini Library to propose a digital library system and he never got a response.

He also proposed an online examination system to the Manzini Regional Education Office (REO). He also never got a response. These two occasions made him realise that young Emaswati innovators could not be taken seriously because the country did not have a success story. "I decided to be that story to be a reference and open up doors for other innovators," he said.

The technologist then went to South Africa to make use of his technological skills. Nkambule opened a company called Cybatar, a software development house now based in Kenya.

He founded this company in 2014. He then launched a tuition fee crowd funding platform through the Cybatar during the first #fees must fall protest in 2015.

The second company he founded was the Financial Technology (FinTech) known as Riovic, which is backed by Rand Merchant Bank's Alpha Code. This company was founded in 2015 and it has been making waves in the insurance industry.

The Sandton-based technologist now wants to bring all the skills, which earned him a place in the Forbes list, to the country. "I have plans to come and establish a technology company, with the goal of enabling a digital economy since there is no underlying infrastructure that allows Emaswati businesses to trade online," Nkambule said

He revealed this yesterday, a few days after he was announced as the ninth person in the list of 30 young Africans to make it to the Forbes Under 30 list. He said he had planned to launch his technology business here in Eswatini this month.

Nkambule mentioned that he planned to start a small business that would employ at least 10 people. "I want to start with a small team of developers and marketers of just 10 in the first year of starting up. I will then scale up as the business grows," he said. He said he had been bringing together a team and would spend most of the month of June establishing the business on the ground.

He said he did not think he would have difficulty starting a business in the country because he had already made a name for himself. For him, it did not make sense not to do anything in this country yet there was so much opportunity.

# 12 days for Oliveira's murder case

THE trial of three suspects accused of the murder of businessman Almor Oliveira has been allocated a total of 12 days.

The dates for the trial were fixed yesterday in the High Court by the legal representatives of both the state and the suspects.

Prominent South African Advocate Barry Roux made his first appearance for some of the suspects in the case yesterday.

The renowned advocate, who became very popular for his legal exploits in the marathon criminal case of South African Paralympian Oscar Pistorious, arrived at the High Court as early as 9am in the company of instructing attorney Noncedo Ndlangamandla.

Crown Counsel Thabo Dlamini from the chambers of the Directorate of Public Prosecutions (DPP) appeared for the state and he has also since instructed a South African advocate. Attorney Leo Gama also made an appearance on behalf of one of the suspects. The legal representatives first met Judge John Magagula in chambers where the dates for the muchanticipated trial were fixed.

The parties then went to open court

where the Crown communicated that the parties, by consent, had identified the dates for the trial. The matter is expected to go for trial from October 1 to 4. It will also be heard from 22 to 25 October, 2018. Proceedings will thereafter resume on November 5 and end on November 8. All the legal representatives consented on the announced dates.

"It is further ordered that the representatives of the Crown and the defence should conduct a pre-trial conference at a date to be determined in order to iron out any issues that they might have in relation to the matter," said Judge Magagula.

Two of the suspects, Dao Hue and Qing Ming are currently in custody while the other female accused is out on bail. They are all charged with the murder of Oliveira, even though the businessman's body was never found.

The Crown contends that it has a reasonable apprehension that the three did murder the businessman and will adduce evidence during the trial to

# Woman hides at Magistrate's Court to escape violent hubby

FEARING for her life, a woman ran to the Siteki Magistrate's Court to seek refuge after she was brutally assaulted by her husband who was recently handed a suspended sentence for a similar offence.

The woman had bandages protruding from beneath her clothing, indicating that she had multiple fresh wounds. She had just been discharged from Good Shepherd Hospital when she decided that she could not go home as she feared that her abusine husband would finish her off upon arrival. This was the situation which court officials had to attend to yesterday. Zandile Gamedze (35) narrated that she was brutally assaulted by her husband, Ameiro Sithole on Sunday evening while at their marital homestead. Of note is that Sithole was in court last Friday, where he faced a charged of common assault.

He was said to have assaulted the same woman with open hands and fists all over the body. Sithole was found guilty of the charge and sentenced to two years in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine. However, half of the sentence was suspended.

He subsequently paid E1 000 fine and was freed. Hardly two days later,

Sithole pounced on the helpless woman again, this time intensifying the assault.

When narrating the incident to the court officials, Gamedze said her husband came home late in the evening and picked up an argument. He is alleged to have suddenly started assaulting and stabbing her several times with a sharp object on the body.

Gamedze said she could not see what the object was but she believed it was a knife. "He stabbed me several times while stating that he wanted to kill me for having reported him to the police on the recent incident," said the visibly traumatised woman.

Gamedze said she was lucky to have managed to escape and screamed for help from neighbours. Paramedics were called to the homestead and she was rushed to the hospital where she was admitted for a day before she was discharged yesterday.

She said her intention of going to the court was to find out if her husband had already been arrested so that she could go home knowing that she would be safe. "I will not be leaving from here if the whereabouts of my husband are unknown," she said.

Court orderlies had to escort the woman to the police station to verify whether or not her husband had been arrested. By the time of compiling this report, the woman was still at the police station.



# MOTSHANE SPENDS E24.5m IN FIVE YRS

MOTSHANE *Inkhundla* has spent a whopping E24 million in a space of five years across seven chiefdoms.

The *Inkhundla*, led by MP Phesheya Hlatshwayo, spent the money from 2013 when the current *Inkhundla* team was voted into office by the Motshane electorate.

Now that this term of office is ending, the committee has since published a report detailing how they worked during the five-year course.

The projects included electricity and water schemes, construction of Siphocosini High kitchen and Siphocosini market. Others included the construction of Bhekephi Primary Hall and the construction of a Neighbourhood Care Point (NCP) in Mhlane.

Motshane *Inkhundla* is divided into seven chiefdoms, namely, Motshane (Nduma), Kupheleni, Mpolonjeni (Mbabane), Sigangeni, Luhlendlweni, Siphocosini, and Mantabeni.

It is worth noting that Motshane has been demarcated into two constituencies by the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC). The demarcation gave birth to Siphocosini *Inkhundla*, which is now made up of four chiefdoms. They include Siphocosini, Mantabeni, Sigangeni, and Luhlendlweni. Motshane *Inkhundla* is among Motshane, Kupheleni and Mpolonjeni.

# CDTC now operational after meeting SHEC's recommendations

CORPORATE Development and Training Centre (CDTC) which was among the four institutions that were closed by the Swaziland Higher Education Council (SHEC) is now fully operational.

The institution was suspended last year in November after SHEC did their assessment, which proved that they were not meeting the required standards, some of which included inadequate toilets and operational space.

The institution's Chief Executive Officer Mainga Mainga said they did conform to the recommendations of SHEC and relocated from their previous setting to a bigger space that also accommodates handicapped students as they now have two sets of lifts to their offices.

"SHEC recommended that we relocate to a more convenient setting in terms of space and we are now situated at Dlanubeka Building and fully operational after they granted us provisional registration status on May 21. Also, we now fall within the list of approved institutions in the country," he said.

In a letter from SHEC approving the institution, it is stated that the institution is expected to improve its operations by addressing all the deficiencies that were identified during the assessment as contained in the Institutional Assessment Report within a period of six months.

"Following receipt of the institution's application for registration and the subsequent institutional assessment, the Swaziland Higher Education Council grants CDTC authority to establish and operate in accordance with Section 19 of the Higher Education Act of 2013, effective 21 May, 2018 to 31 May 2020," reads the letter. CDTC offers accredited academic and professional programmes from international Examination bodies based in the United Kingdom and they are the Cambridge International College (CIC), Institute of Commercial Management (ICM) Association of Accounting Technicians (AAT) and Association of Certified Chartered Accounts

Other institutions that were closed down together with CDTC last year for not meeting the required standards are the African Prime Institute of Science and Technology (APIST), and the Providence International Training Centre (PITI) and Managemer Training and Developmen 'institute (MTF)

# GOGO (66) ACCUSED OF WITCHCRAFT VACATES MALKERNS

GOGO Thusi(66) and her acquaintance who were accused of witchcraft by the community of S'thomo in Malkerns vacated the area after their release from the police last week.

According to a source, the old woman and his acquaintance, identified as Mahlalela (44), vacated the area last Friday morning.

"They have packed everything that belongs to them. Their houses are now empty," he alleged. He however said he was not sure where the two had moved to," he added.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba said the old woman and her acquaintance were freed without charges as the police did not find them on the wrong side of the law.

"These were only accusations," said Mamba.

He said the two felt threatened and vacated the area.

'y feared for their lives after

they were attacked by over 200 residents of S'thomo Community for suspected witchcraft. The members of the public turned violent and bayed for their blood. The two had to seek refuge at Malkerns Police Station for safety. The angry mob stormed their house with a female prophet who is alleged to have had a vision.

In the vision, the prophet allegedly saw that something was not right within the compound they shared. It is said she woke up to inspect what she had seen from the vision.

Outside, it is said she allegedly found Mahlalela performing some ritual that involved sprinkling water (kuchela) in between the litany of stick and mud houses that complete the compound. This was around midnight.

The prophet then raised an alarm calling upon other residents of the densely populated and clustered location to come and witness what she had just seen.

A number of residents ran to the scene with some coming from the nearby Mangozeni location.

The mob confronted Thusi and

Mahlalela who refuted the allegations of witchcraft levelled against them. In the middle of the highhanded interrogation, some of the residents attempted to set alight a hut (indumba) that Thusi used to consult in as it is believed she doubled as a traditional healer.

The *indumba* was partly burned. However, the mob succeeded in destroying another hut where her clients would bath or steam as part of taking any prescribed medication.

According to a source close to the matter, the mob made it clear that they were going to hurt the old woman as they alleged this was not the first incident involving her.

Malkerns police who were armed to the teeth arrived in the nick of time to rescue the two who had been marked for death.

On that fateful night the police had to leave their cars a couple of metres away from the compound since the road had been blocked with big logs. The two were quickly taken to the police station for safety purposes while police investigated the matter.

He stated that around April, he received a call from the Lobamba Police Station assigning him to investigate a rape charge laid by the minor's mother who was at the police station together with the survivor.

The minor was taken to hospital

by detective Ndlangamandla for examination.

The police later headed back to the police station as the suspect was already in custody by that time. The officer introduced himself and further formally charged him with the charge of abduction.

The doctor's report confirmed to a indeed penetration had occurred o the minor's private parts.

The accused acknowledged the charge and claimed that the mir or had consented to it.

He told the court that he had already learnt a lesson and was about to fin-

ish school as he had big dreams. For some time, Magistrate Lenhle Zulu was deep in thought before

passing out the sentence. The magistrate advised the accused to go back to school.

She added that she would be doing a routine follow-up on the accused. Sentencing has been scheduled for November 29, 2019 after writing his final Form Five examinations.

# Reckless driver knocks down pedestrian at Sidvwashini

A pedestrian was left with serious injuries after being knocked down by a reckless driver at Sidvwashini.

Amandla Seluleko Dlamini (26) of Mangwaneni on Friday appeared before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu where he was slapped with two counts, one being reckless driving and the second was defying a court

Dlamini conducted his own defence and pleaded guilty to the charges laid against him.

It is said on May 15, Dlamini, being a driver of a Toyota Voxy at or arround Sidvwashini, Qobonga area, did wrongfully and negligently drove the said motor vehicle along Somhlolo road and knocked down a pedestrian identified as Hazel Mashaba Greenhead (49) of Mahwalala.

It is said Dlamini was driving at a high speed in a narrow road and failed to apply breaks timeously,

swerved to the left and knocked the pedestrian, who suffered serious concussion and was later whisked to the Mbabane Government Hospital for medical assistance.

On May 28, Dlamini failed to apear in court after being summoned, thus violated the dignity, reputation and authority of the

"You can't just knock down someone from behind in broad day light. It is evident to the court that you were reckless," said Magistrate Zulu. The magistrate further stated that young people often drive at a high speed and cause unnecesary accidents, which shows that they have no respect for pedestrians. In mitigation, the accused pleaded for leniency, stating that he stays with his sickly grandmother who solely depends on him. Zulu then sentenced the accused person to E700 fine or five months imprisonment for reckless driving and E500 or five months for disobeying a court order, However, the sentences would run concurrently.

A 58-year-old man from Nsangwini collapsed and died mysteriously while eating food at his homestead.


The man is said to have been asking for food minutes before his death.





#### PSYCHOLOGICAL abuse is a form of abuse that births all sorts of abuse.

You might have heard of the saying that "it all starts from the head" or "it's all in your mind" well the mind is a powerful tool that makes way to our actions.

Our body experiences, should it be that which we hear or see and touch is a gateway to our actions. One can state that it creates our inner self.

Psychological experiences begin to develop as early as time of birth. All a child is exposed to and experiences forms his or her character that is, the way he/she would respond to aspects of life that he/she might come across. You should take note that the words psychological and emotional abuse will be used interchangeably.

Physical abuse, financial and sexual abuse are forms of abuse that are most spoken off and often emotional abuse is not treated as serious as the others. What is most important to acknowledge is that without psychological abuse, the chances of the other forms of abuse to occur are very limited. Domestic true when the abuse is psychological, rather than physical. Noticing and acknowledging the signs of an abusive relationship is the first step to ending

By definition psychological abuse (also referred to as psychological violence, emotional abuse, or mental abuse) is a form of abuse, characterised by a person subjecting, or exposing, another person to behaviour that may result in psychological trauma, including anxiety, chronic depression, or post-traumatic stress disorder.

A discussion paper was prepared by Deborah Doherty and Dorothy Berglund on Psychological Abuse, from which abstract a child's development into an adult has been discussed and also stating how emotional abuse may be disturbed by the Psychological Abuse. We will consider some of the findings of the 2015 paper. Individuals are pushed through life stages by biological and social demands. This is important because it infers that individuals cannot remain in a stage until they have properly confronted their crises, but may be forced to enter the next stage unprepared. Therefore, properly managing crises within each stage is important for the successful completion of the later stages in adulthood. Erikson describes one of the first stages leading to adulthood as



identity vs. role confusion (Logan, 1986). This stage is often experienced during the teenage years; in this stage adolescents experience an "identity crisis", which is described as an attempt to define who you are (e.g., career, religion, sexual identity, and so on), where you are heading and how you fit into society. As adolescents progress through this stage, they begin to focus in on developing an identity. This identity consolidation in adolescence provides the first real opportunity to develop continuity with the past, meaning in the present, and direction for the future. As such, identity consolidation forms

the cornerstone of the capacity to do well and the basis of self-acceptance and self-esteem. The successful resolution of identity issues provides the young person with a clear sense of self, well-defined personal beliefs and values, and a feeling of place within the

There are variables that take place throughout early developmental stages, which continue to affect individuals as they advance into adulthood. A variety of abuses such as verbal, mental, and sexual have been proven to negatively affect the course of children's life responses.

type of maltreatment that refers to the failure by the caregiver to provide needed, age appropriate care although financially able to do so or offered financial or other means to do so.

Abused children are also more likely to engage in sexual risk taking, causing them to be 25 per cent more likely to experience teenage pregnancy and putting them at a greater risk of contracting STD's.

Abuse has also been linked with criminal behaviour and an alarming number of inmates have been abused mentally as children even though the numbers may be higher as most people do not know when they might be mentally abused as children, however, it is through a background interview at a later stage in life that researchers find out that the particular person had suffered emotional abuse at an early age.

It is important that psychological abuse be noted and taken seriously.

The country is faced with alarming news every week. Murder cases in the most inhuman manner; people committing suicide; children being sexually abused; school going children falling pregnant in school; mothers beating their children to death and spouses abusing each other. In all of these there is one connecting factor and that is psychological abuse of children.

# 'Black brain drain' in Cape Town: Symptom of a far deeper problem

THE Western Cape in general and Cape Town in particular is - as Tinyiko Ngwenya experienced alienating to people of colour.

The lack of representation, particularly in senior leadership in corporates, is striking. By contrast, this gives Johannesburg its allure. For Ngwenya, the desirability lay in the myriad positive representations of inclusive society.

But this attraction can also mask the underlying and insidious psychological trauma caused by colonialism and later, apartheid.

Cape Town rips the plaster off the wound and allows people of colour to get in touch with - or, to phrase it differently, never escape - the lived reality of feeling less than white. No matter how distinguished one's accompeople of colour, mirroring a more uplishments, this holds true. An eminent professor of colour at a leading

university in the Western Cape once said this of his experience. Or, as it was articulated by Ms. Ngwenya:

"No matter how hard I worked, I never really felt good enough, and that inferiority complex was as a result of being a minority."

It is an awareness continuously reinforced by corporate cultures that remain, largely, white and male.

The problem, therefore, is not Cape Town, but rather that this experience

reflects the oversight by political initiatives to address the psychological legacies of internalised oppression of people of colour, and internalised dominance by white people. Systematic methods of oppression, holistically designed and legislated to cast people of colour as inferior to the celebrated superiority of whites, have shaped our identities retrospectively. According to psychology, these seems an individual responsibility. internalised experiences often remain

in the unconscious. We rely on triggers to elicit the pain associated with those experiences, and corporate Cape Town is a trigger of such pain - not the cause. Since there has been no political effort to address this issue, at least not on the scale of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC), we often remain largely unaware of our trauma. Furthermore, psychological pain, unlike economic inequality, is not immediately visible to the untrained eye. And even then, it is News24

# DONE RIGHT, LAND REDISTRIBUT WILL BOOST ECONOMY

JOHANNESBURG - The expectations and fears around land redistribution are what bedevil the national conversation on this issue rather than the process of giving black people more access to land.

The EFF and some elements in the ANC are building up an anticipation that farms, businesses and urban properties are going to be expropriated on a large scale without any compensation and handed out to ordinary people, instantly making them wealthy.

AfriForum and other right wing whites are playing along for their own reasons, warning white people that 'the blacks' are going to throw them off their properties as happened in Zimbabwe and that would finally destroy the economy and the peace.

Justice

Instead, it should be an ideal opportunity to settle an old and serious issue - indeed, the original sin of the colonial era.

If done properly, quickly and on a big enough scale, land redistri-bution could actually achieve more than just address the strong emotions around redress, justice, symbolism and historic evil. It could actually become a major injection to economic growth.

But nobody will become rich

overnight, despite Julius Malema and Jacob Zuma's populist promises. Land itself is not as important The reason? The massive moveas what one does with it. The people of, for instance, Mali and Mozambique have ample access to land, yet they remain among the poorest in the world.

Founding Principles in Chapter One of the Constitution that cements the rule of law and the supremacy of the Constitution. If the rule of law is followed, property owners will always have recourse to the courts. Chapter One of the Constitution may only be amended with 75 per cent of Parliament and six out of the nine provinces agreeing to it.

It is clear from the national mood that if the status quo is allowed to remain unaltered for much longer, the emotions around land will get more and more inflamed and could eventually lead to so much instability that our democracy could be under threat. Even the hardest Afrikaner nationalist must know deep down that it cannot be normal that so few black South Africans own so little land and that so many black people still live in squalor where they have to bring up their children.

Urban land hunger is clearly the biggest and most urgent problem. I cannot remember more than one or two illegal occupations of farms over the last decades, but we have had hundreds of cases of urban land occupation just in the last

ment of people from the communal black areas to the cities over the last two decades. Between 2000 and 2010, the population of Gauteng had grown by 31 per cent and of the Western Cape by 29 per cent - a movement of more than five million people in 10 short years. The governments since 1994 had not anticipated this and certainly didn't plan for it. Almost two-thirds of our nation are now urbanised, the highest in Africa

About seven million people live in desperate conditions in vast informal settlements or squatter camps in the country. Seven million out of a population of 56 million. Moreover, many of the formal townships are hugely overpopulated and offer a very low quality of life.

The government is now planning an ambitious project to rapidly supply open tracts of land in and around cities with water and sewerage infrastructure and then transfer them to people with title deeds and permission to build their own houses.

Abandoned buildings in inner cities will be renovated into decent

It is in this project that expro-priation will be essential in terms of costs and time.

We are talking blandly about expropriation without compensation, but actually it means expropriation with no compensation, very little compensation, ample compensation or compensation equalling full market value.

Constitution

It is worth reading Section 25 (3) of the Constitution in this regard. It states that regard should be paid to "all relevant circumstances" which it defines as "the current use of the property; the history of the acquisition and the use of the property; the market value of the property; the extent of direct state investment and subsidy and the acquisition and beneficial capital improvement of the property; and the purpose of expropriation."

The redistribution of agricultural land is also important, but not quite as urgent. Post-settlement support to new farmers is more difficult than acquiring the land the vast majority of redistributed farms have become commercial failures because of the lack of support. The government has confirmed that it sits on more than 4 000 commercial farms that it hasn't been able to give to new farmers. Former president Kgalema Motlanthe's High Level Report commissioned by Parliament makes it clear that state capacity, an incompetent bureaucracy and corruption are more to blame for the slow pace of land reform that any other factor.

So why would the government embark on the large scale expropriation of farms now if it doesn't have the capability to establish successful new farmers on the land? AgriSA, representing most commercial farmers, has proved to be very pragmatic and this week again confirmed its acknowledgement of the untenability of having so few black farmers on the land.

It has spent some R330 million on supporting emerging farmers over the last year and is committed to step up those efforts even more.

But establishing new black commercial farmers is just one part of the solution. We urgently need to empower large numbers of smallholder farmers on the land in every province and assist them to be productive. This is done very successfully in Ethiopia where more than a million families were given small pockets of land and ample support from the state.

A recent opinion poll quoted by the Institute for Poverty, Land and Agrarian Studies indicated that about a third of black South Africans want land for the purpose of growing food and that the vast major-ity of them said they would be happy with five hectares or less. Most of these people are from the rural areas, probably farm workers and people in the former Bantustans, and some who had recently become urbanised and yearn for a piece of land for a patch of maize and a few cows and chickens. It is good to agitate against any reckless expropriation process and illegal land grabs, but it is as important for citizens and civil society to agitate for a speedy and ambitious redistribution of land.

It will benefit the landless as well as those fortunate citizens who already own land, urban and agricultural land, because it will lower the levels of anger and resentment and make South Africa a more just and stable country.

# FNB to partner with rural shops to function as mini-branches

MOST rural areas in the country do not have bank branches, let alone ATMs which makes banking facilities very difficult to access.

To deal with this challenge, First National Bank will be the first bank in the country to partner with shops in far flung areas to provide 'banking' facilities including cash deposits, withdrawals, sending money and purchasing of other living necessities from stores in the villages.

The product will be known as Cashplus, FNB Chief Executive Officer Dennis Mbingo announced recently.

"It is very difficult for any bank to build branches everywhere, even where there are customers to be serviced. Running a branch is extreme-



how can we help you? answer and shall be pro-

ly expensive. So here's our plan—we shall be approaching a few hundred small businesses in rural areas and asking them to provide some of our 'low risk' services through their shops in the rural areas," he told participants attending an Entrepreneur of the Year Award (EYA) networking cocktail held at the Happy Valley Hotel.

He explained that instead of building branches, FNB would ask small businessmen to become the bank's associate branches for some banking services

"We have always said it is not right for a customer to board two/three/four buses in order to access financial services. We think we finally have the answer and shall be processing a formal appli-

cation to our Regulator within days," he said, adding that this product still needs to be approved by the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA). Mbingo is always adamant that banking does not have to be a problem.

"We cannot solve every problem at once, but there is an obsession we are trying to cascade across all our businesses around obsessing over the customer experience. We need to make banking simpler and friendlier. Not just through alternative channels, but also through improving the service experience," he said, adding: "The latter is a massive culture change that will be painful to instil, but necessary in an era where customers have a growing range of options".

In another matter, Mbingo lamented the poor understanding of many of the bank's products. He made an example of the FNB with its hurdle free solutions for many things which customers do not need to approach their branch for.

In South Africa, FNB was recently hailed as being the first bank to introduce a mobile money platform for unbanked and under-banked South Africans. Known as eWalleteXtra, the mobile bank account allows consumers to use a feature phone or a smartphone to open a bank account without ever walking into a branch.



# PLASTIC INGESTION KILLING HUNDREDS OF CATTLE

WHILST there is a pollution problem, farmers are losing hundreds of cattle who ingest plastic bags.

This this was revealed by the Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Christopher Gamedze, who was a guest of honour at Sibane Hotel during the commemoration of World Environment Day.

The discussion on the use of plastic bags in the country, according to Gamedze, is not new as a draft control of plastic bag regulations were tabled in Parliament over two years back in

2015

"The theme is nothing new to us as a nation, in 2015 during the same day we raised the issue of plastic pollution, which culminated on the tabling in Parliament of the draft control of plastic bags regulations," he said.

The country, according to Gamedze, is in the process of implementing the 17th Sustainable Development Goals, where 12 of the goals have targets linked directly or indirectly to environmental sustainability.

Gamedze said the country was facing a serious problem of littering which was threatening to destroy the country's unique scenic beauty

The government is also spending money in damaged infrastructure due to clogging of drainage systems by plastics.

Gamedze also said the county has been able to survive without the use of plastic bags where in the past they used organic packaging material made out of leaves and grass to carry even the most perishable of their products such as meat.

"While the country is still considering all best available techniques, my ministry strongly believes that we should not rule out the possibility of going the route of a total ban on the production and use of single use consumer plastic bags," he said.

# Civil society fails to establish a local Publish What You Pay chapter

MOVES by civil society organisations which began in 2012 to establish Eswatini's own Publish What You Pay, a body with chapters in different African countries whose main purpose is to force governments to be transparent with the exact number of taxes received from mining companies have failed

Representatives from different mining communities in the country yesterday who had converged at Sibane Hotel in a CANGO Swaziland National Alternative Mining Indaba (SNAMI) expressed great disappointment on the failed bid by civil society to establish a Publish What You Pay chapter in the country. CANGO is the Coordinating Assembly of Civil Society Organisations.

The Indaba, which ends tomorrow, is attended by representatives from different organisations and communities affected by mining activities in the country.

Speakers from different countries such as South Africa, Zambia, Zimbabwe and Mozambique are also part of this Indaba. Questions emerged when Charles Mulila who is the Zambia Chairperson of Publish What You Pay made a presentation on the benefits that this movement had brought not only for communities living in mining areas in his country but also in forcing government and mining companies to openly declare the exact money made from mining as well as total taxes declared to government by these companies.

Mulila explained that in Zambia, Publish What You Pay's work had gone as far as determining the exact quantities of minerals in different jurisdictions and determining the quantities being mined.

In his presentation, he urged Eswatini to ensure that a local Publish What You Pay chapter is established to hold government accountable on the exact gains made from the mining

It was then that CANGO Programme Officer Mphile Sihlongonyane told the gathering that efforts to establish a local Publish What You Pay Chapter had, in actual fact, started way back in 2012 when his organisation formulated an Economic Roadmap for the extractive industries, agriculture and other sectors.

He said in 2015, top representatives from the Zambian and South African chapters of Publish What You Pay attended a civil society conference in the country where the advantages of having this body were clearly presented to delegates.

Sihlongonyane explained that the Anti-Corruption Commission also made attempts to assist in the formulation of a local chapter with government having been roped in at some

However, the whole idea simply collapsed as to date, there is no local Publish What You

Pay. The failed bid by civil society, however, did not go down well with participants attending the mining Indaba yesterday who unanimously agreed on the need for a strong civil society movement to hold government and mining companies accountable on the proceeds the country receives from extractive industries.

Nompumelelo Dlamini from the Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) called for all those involved in efforts to establish an Eswatini chapter of Publish What You Pay to give a full account on how exactly efforts to establish such an important body had failed.

She said a detailed report would be of help going forward because the exact hindrances would have been established.

The country's mining sector is currently not so diverse as compared to other SADC countries as there are only two fully-fledged mining activities at Maloma Colliery and Lufafa

# Disappointment as commissioner of mines fails to show up

DESPITE being lined up as one of the speakers on the first day of the Swaziland National Alternative Mining Indaba (SNAMI), the commissioner of mines in the ministry of natural resources and energy could not make his presentation yesterday.

The commissioner was largely expected to give an overview of the mining industry at Eswatini where participants were looking forward to gaining firsthand insight of the industry in the coun-

Workshop organisers, however, informed participants that the commissioner would not make his presentation anymore because he was reportedly out of office.

Velaphi Ndzimandze from the Swaziland Ex-Mine Workers Association lamented the commissioner's absence from the Indaba.

# Platform

He voiced his concerns after Simon Vilakazi from the Economic Justice Network of South Africa asked the local participants whether Swazi communities are afforded a platform where they can discuss their expectations of the mining industry with government and how mining affects their communities.

In response, Ndzimandze said: "No ways, we don't have such a platform in the country. If that platform existed, the ministry of natural resources and energy would be here with us," he said.

Another participant from one of the mining communities said he had worked for several South African mines where management always reported back to its workers on the production levels attained each

He lamented the lack of such feedback in the country as he further wondered if Swati people were benefitting at all from the God-given natural resources exploited by mining companies.

# Alternative packaging material could boost country's economy

A total of 1 million plastic bottles are bought every minute, 50 per cent of

plastic is only used once and disposed.

Attendees to the event were encouraged to protect the environment; the 2030 Agenda for sustainable Development re-affirms the lasting protection of the planet and its natural resources.

The single use of plastic has been said to cause severe environmental chal-

Plastic bags more than polluting the environment and being not being able to be recycled are said to be polluting the ocean floor which also causes a lot of challenges including amongst other, ghost fishing which traps endangered species in the ocean, tangling fish and other ocean creatures thus creating a harbour for diseases.

On another note, the alternative packaging options according to Dessalegne could be explored as an opportunity for business for both the private sector and government as well.

The private sector could consider filling the gap while providing employment where the government could be supplied by the sector.

Furthermore, this could help farmers in the long run as they are able to have more fields which are fertile as paper bags as opposed to plastic bags are degradable.

This could also help in reducing livestock eating plastic bags and eventually causing diseases if the meat is con-



# BIJIS EPIC ME COMPETITION DANS

With a revised M Suspension, active differential and a smidgen more power, the M4 Competition Pack packs a punch on paper... Sean Parker tests it along two of the Western Cape's most demanding roads.

CAPE TOWN - 20 years ago, only the very best road cars were fitted with carbon-ceramic brakes. The fade-free brakes were reserved for hypercar royalty such as the Ferrari Enzo and the Porsche Carrera GT.

Now think of a road car fitted with a carbon-fibre roof... and you'll find automakers such as McLaren, Mercedes (CLK-GTR) and others who used that technology in a road car.

Fast forward to the mid-2000s and BMW's first and only V8-powered M3; the E92 model used a heavy V8 and therefore weight-saving measures such as a carbon-fibre roof was brought into play.

And now in 2018, we've had the M4 Competition Pack on test and it's fitted with ceramic brakes and a carbon fibre roof, the former is used for face-changing stopping power and the second to save reduce weight.

Power, like other M4s, is still derived from a 3.0-litre straight six turbocharged engine, producing 331kW (19 more than the standard version) and 550Nm.

What makes the CP different? It wears spectacular 20" wheels, features an M Sport exhaust system swathed in black, the dark hue theme extends to the rear badge, mirrors, grille and window surrounds.

Lightweight bucket seats are the only change inside, thankfully they can be adjusted electronically.

What's it like to drive?

What is the to dive.

What better way to test the more powerful, meaner and edgier M4 on two of the Western Cape's most famous roads - Helshoogte and Franschhoek

Pass.

To get the best out of those roads, I rose early on a Sunday morning, hurriedly chugged down some coffee and fired up the M4. Apologies to the neighbours whom I disturbed.

Like other M models, the M4 CP has configurable settings for its dampers, engine and steering. EVERYTHING was tuned to comfort mode for the highway portion.

The journey along the dark N1 is treacherous (because of rogue hitchhikers), but the BMW's full LED adaptive headlights aided my quest towards the university town of Stellenbosch.

At the foot of Helshoogte Pass I prod the M1 button on the steering wheel that asks to confirm if I want to experience the 331kW and 550Nm in its most demanding setting. Remember all that power goes through the rear rubber. It's an exciting prospect as the manual mode of the seven-speed dual clutch gearbox is engaged.

EVERYTHING is in aggressive mode. The distinctive six-cylinder noise fills the cabin and I zone out to concentrate on what's in front of me: long, sweeping kilometres of asphalt and more importantly no traffic.

BMW claims a 0-100km/h dash, with the seven-speed dual-clutch transmission, in 4.0 seconds (0.1 seconds quicker than the standard model). Top speed is limited to 280km/h. It feels that quick. Maybe quicker. There's

so much torque going through the rear wheels that the M4 has no qualms about spinning its tyres in

second gear.

It's lively, visceral and consuming, like watching a Christopher Nolan film, it requires concentration. Are the stiffer anti-roll bars and the revised M Suspension with newer dampers and

springs tangible when driving on demanding roads? Yes, the car feels sorted and more racer than grand tourer. The active differential also takes the experience to a different level. It's a step up. And yes, BMW has built more intense M4s (GTS, CS and the DTM), but those are all sold.


The drive on Franschhoek Pass requires less outright grunt and more driver input as the twisties have me climbing onto the anchors as late as possible, tugging the paddle shift to make sure I'm in the right gear to exploit the power. I haven't heard my photographer in the back for 10 minutes and I call to find out if he's fine. His thumbs up answer the affirmative.

Summary

For R1 448 636, the M4 CP offers you an exhilarating driving experience, a piercing exhaust note and looks special enough to stand out among regular M cars.

It's a top-notch package that has the intensity of a Pep Guardiola football team when you're driving it as close to the limit as your skill allows. It's a good package that's damn hard to fault







# CAN THE MERCEDES-BENZ X-CLASS BAKKIE PERFORM AS A DAILY, FAMILY VEHICLE?

CAPE TOWN - The Mercedes-Benz X-Class bakkie has finally landed in SA having been launched locally in George this week.

Wheels24 had the privilege of driving one of the vehicles prior to its local launch, an X250d.

The X-Class has been highly anticipated since news of its arrival was announced in 2016 at the Geneva auto show. The creation of the vehicle was met with interest by SA's local bakkie lovers and it was immediately thought to be a bakkie for the super-rich as its prices were expected to be exorbitant.

An entry-level X-Class costs the same price as a top-of-the-range Toyota Hilux bakkie.

It's still a premium vehicle and we'll have to wait and see if it will be a vehicle of status for city-slickers or if anyone will use it for bundu-bashing or a workhorse on a farm of sorts. I would use it for all of the above.

The biggest highlight about driving the new Mercedes-Benz X-Class bakkie, was the look on everyone's face when they realised what they were seeing.

The first couple days, wait, make that every day, I drove the X-Class, I was greeted with excited hoots from fellow drivers on the road, loads of "thumbs ups" and ecstatic waving. I also had curious crowds gathering in my driveway. But my best was of those doing double takes and asking: "What

is that!? A Mercedes bakkie?"

Its design is an acquired taste, and most people probably fell for the badge rather than its charming looks. Is it ugly? No, of course not, it's just that a Ford Ranger, Toyota Hilux and even an Isuzu KB are better looking - at least in my book.

The front end styling includes a huge Merc badge, and it surely states its presence on the road, but the X-Class was never built to win any beauty pageants. I'd like to believe that but then I'm still wondering: Who's going to buy this bakkie and what will they use it for?

For my little family, it served as a daily drive to work for a few days and it proved to do the task rather well. It has side steps and grab handles in the right places and it was comfortable for a long haul in traffic. Even easier enough for my little one to haul herself into her car seat in the back.

The 2.3-litre diesel unit mated to a sixspeed manual gear-

box has smooth shifting, but in all honesty, it drives more like a Navara than any of its Merc stable-mates.

And that's no surprise because the two vehicles share the same DNA - yet Mercedes claims the bakkies are apples and oranges despite all X-Class derivatives sharing Nissan/Renault engines and transmissions, and it's even built at a Nissan factory.

It can work hard too, if given the task and even with a loaded bay, the torque makes driving effortless. Then again, it is still a Mercedes after all despite where it's made or regardless of its Japanese partnerships. Give it some foot, and it's happy to give some grunt on

the highway or off the beaten track.

The automaker claims that the X-class has a "stiffened chassis, wider body, retuned suspension, better-equipped interior and better cabin insulation compared to the Nissan".

The fact that it shares all of that Nissan DNA really is not a bad thing. I have always loved the Navara bakkie and the fact that the X-Class is based on that should really give it some street cred.

However, I will say that I was

disappointed in the vehicle's interior.

Yes it has a Merc facia and for a minute at first entry, you'd think you're sitting in an entrylevel C-Class sedan, but then

you notice the X-shaped air vents. But that's just it, I was expecting more flare and wanted to be blown away by the interior.

Instead it's a bit bland inside the cabin and I think the centre console could have been designed better to be more functional.

#### Would I use it as a workhorse? Of course I would.

It has a large load bay that can hold anything be it furniture, water tanks or picking up the neighbourhood kids and taking them for a drive around the block. I actually wish I could drive it right now as I need a bakkie to purchase a large kennel for our new puppy.

down 1.6 percent, compared to the


first five months of 2017.



# RANGE ROVER VELAR D300 R-DYNAMIC HSE

CAPE TOWN - The latest SUV from the British/ Indian automaker is undoubtedly a looker. In fact, the new Range Rover Velar has more presence than 'The Rock' on a IMAX screen.

But what is Land Rover offering with this model? We spent a week with the D300 HSE model to find out.

# Firstly, where does it fit in?

It's slightly smaller than the Range Rover Sport, just 47mm shorter in length and 75mm shorter in width. It therefore slots in between the Sport and the Evoque. Well, that was easy. (It's also arguably the best looking of the three).

# Which engines does have it?

You can choose from a duo of four-cylinder Ingenium diesels; 132kW and 177kW variants, along with two petrol engines delivering 184kW/365Nm and 221kW/400Nm.

There's also a 280kW supercharged V6 petrol engine and a V6 diesel unit with 700Nm.

The engine powering our test unit was a 3.0-litre V6 twin-turbodiesel with 221kW and 700Nm. It has sufficient grunt to overtake lethargic hatchbacks in Long Street. It uses an 8-speed ZF automatic gearbox that's super smooth. For the record, it'll hit 100km/h from standstill in a claimed 6.5 seconds.

Our test car was fitted with optional satin chromed paddle-

shifts and the only time I used them was on a blast around Signal Hill. Leave it in 'drive' and potter around the city and climb the pavement in Green Point when *ColdPlay* are in town.

# But it looks so fancy, can it even off-road bru?

Totally. It's fitted with the firm's second-generation Terrain Response system as well as All Terrain Progress Control. Via the large touchscreen there are a myriad of modes that set up the vehicle to drive over sand, mud, gravel and road. I never took the Velar off the beaten track, mainly because it felt so at home in the city.

So, it's got air suspension as standard, which puts ground clearance at a lofty 251mm. You only drove it in the city? Isn't that wasting a car with 4x4 capabilities?

We're city people, well most

people are, because that's where we live, work and mostly play. So, all I'm saying is, you're more likely to see a Velar parked outside *Shimmy Beach* than trawling up an Atlantis sand dune.

#### Cool, so it's packed with features because it's the HSE model, right?

Correct. Let's begin in the front: the seats can be manoeuvred electronically in 18 different directions, oh and they're heated and cooled. Let's not forget the massage function. Is this why affluent people always look so relaxed?

There's a long list of features on this model, including: a Wi-Fi Hotspot feature, adaptive cruise control that allows you to maintain the speed of the car in front, an electronic tailgate function that can be used handsfree, blindspot monitor, a navigation system and assistance via cam-

eras for parallel and perpendicular parking.

## Alright, so it's an impressive piece of kit, but it must have a hectic price tag?

Well, yeah. It's a premium product that is arguably all the car you need. Our test unit retails for R1.35-million, which is a chunk of change. That doesn't seem to halt South Africans from parking one in their security estate driveway.

337 Velars found new homes in 2017, bear in mind the SUV was launched in November. In January (the poorest year of the month), 99 Velars were sold and in February that figure dropped slightly to 88. Not bad, not bad at all.







# RAMAPHORIA MUST NOT MISLEAD US'

JOHANNESBURG-Former Deputy Finance Minister and current MTN board member Mcebisi Jonas has warned against the "Ramaphoria", saying the ANC was still faced with a lot of challenges that have moved beyond just an "individual".

Jonas was speaking at a breakfast meeting at the East London Golf Course on Monday, where ANC Ward 18 by-election councillor candidate Andrew Sokolich was introduced to residents.

Jonas said the country was still faced with a lot of youth unemployment,

slow gross domestic product growth.

"The 'Ramaphoria' must not mislead us and cloud us from the huge challenges that the ANC is still faced with. Taking a look at the figures comparing our GDP we are far behind as a country compared to other economies that are developing," he said.

In the last quarter, the GDP grew at only 3.1 per cent. Speaking about the state capture, Jonas, who was among the first people to speak up against the notorious business family, the Guptas, he described it as a systematic structural challenge that was just

"raw"

He called on state security agencies to be effectively used to fight against corruption, instead of being used as political hit squads.

"The country has enough legislation to fight corruption. The state security entities must be effective and be used for the sole purpose of fighting corruption and not political battles. Political battles must be fought politically. We must dismantle corruption from the private and public sector," he said.

# Zuma's friends vow to pay for his corruption trial

DURBAN - Business friends of former president Jacob Zuma say they will foot his legal bill should he be unable to afford fees to fight his corruption charges.

Zuma will on Friday make his second appearance in the Durban High Court regarding his arms deal corruption charges.

It has been reported that the former statesman was struggling to pay his legal fees.

#### **Problems**

National Funeral Practitioners Association of South Africa (Nafupa SA) secretary Nkosenhle Shezi said the forum would make means to finance Zuma if he declared that he had financial problems. "Since we love him, if we were to find out that he has financial problems, we would try our best to assist him. But right now he has not approached us for any kind of support," said Shezi.

President Cyril Ramaphosa early this year promised that the state would pay for Zuma's legal costs, since the alleged crimes were committed while he was working for the state.

The DA in March approached court demanding that Zuma refund the state R15.3million he had spent in attempting to prevent the charges from being reinstated.

When Zuma appeared in court in April, scores of his supporters held a night vigil and marched to the court to support him dressed in ANC regalia, although the national leadership had instructed them not to associate party structures and colours with the case.

"The night vigil would be between 6pm tomorrow and 6am on Friday, and on Friday morning we will march from King Dinuzulu Park to the high court," Shezi said.

ANC Youth League provincial spokesperson Mandla Shange said the league would this week outline its programme for supporting Zuma. *News24* 

# Blade Nzimande not keeping Dudu Myeni as his advisor

# Police's new bosses crack down on 'criminal cops'

JOHANNESBURG C- No fewer than 10 police generals are accused of corruption amounting to billions, and at least 27 crime intelligence members are also facing charges.

The national police commissioner and his political head talked tough on crime yesterday, while admitting that they also faced some serious questions within their own ranks, as several senior members of the South African Police Service (SAPS) are under investigation for crimes.

National police commissioner General Khehla Sitole said their main focus in fighting serious crimes, such as cashin-transit robberies, hijackings, house robberies and taxi and gang violence, was to disarm the criminals and respond to scenes in record time.

But, Sitole said, no police officer was above the law and all officers who were guilty of any crime would be flushed out of the service.

The Independent Police Investigative Directorate (Ipid) is making headway in its investigations into 10 police gen-

erals who are accused of corruption amounting to billions of rands.

Sitole said the SAPS was also initiating its own investigations and suspended two lieutenant-generals in recent weeks.

It also recently came to light that at least 27 members of the police's crime intelligence service are facing charges for infractions ranging from traffic violations to serious criminal offences.

Police Minister Bheki Cele said the days of police officials sitting behind desks had come to an end, as they would now be deployed to identified crime hot spots countrywide. Their focus would be on combating serious crimes such as cash-in-transit heists, car hijackings, murders, house robberies, and gang violence.

As part of the reaction plan, an aeroplane for the Directorate for Priority Crime Investigation (the Hawks) plus another plane, all police helicopters, and 122 high-powered vehicles would be on standby for operations.

# 'ANC NEC 'was wrong' when it decided ANC members should not support Zuma'

JOHANNESBURG - The ANC National Executive Committee (NEC) was wrong when it previously decided that ANC members should not support former president Jacob Zuma when he appeared in the KwaZulu-Natal High Court in Durban for corruption.

This is the view of Umkhonto weSizwe Military Veterans Association (MKMVA) spokesperson Carl Niehaus.

"The former president of the ANC, OR Tambo once told me, you never take a decision that you cannot implement, and you never take a decision that would divide the organisation. Out of those scores, the NEC of the ANC failed," he added.

Niehaus was speaking at a press briefing in Durban on Monday, held to unveil plans ahead of Zuma's court appearance on Friday.

Zuma is facing 16 charges which related to 783 payments he allegedly received in connection with the controversial multibillion-rand arms deal.

"As MKMVA, we will participate in the events of tomorrow and Friday, not because we want to be rebels or disregard the decision of the ANC as our mother body, but because we believe that comradeship should extend all, the way," said Niehaus.

# CHURCHES TO CONTINUE SUPPORTING ZUMA 'SPIRITUALLY', BUT NOT FINANCIALLY

DURBAN - A KwaZulu-Natalbased bishop said on Monday that churches backing Jacob Zuma would continue their "spiritual support" for the former state president but were unable to assist with his legal expenses.

"We are not doing any fundraising, we don't have the capacity...we are not working on that at all. We are supporting the former president and his

family spiritually," said Bishop Vusi Dube, founder of the eThekwini Community Church International.

Dube was speaking to the African News Agency (ANA) shortly before a media briefing at the church, based in Durban's city centre.

His church, along with several others falling under the National Interfaith Churches of South Africa (NICSA), had gathered to announce activities

taking place before Zuma's second appearance at the Durban High Court last Friday, where he is facing corruption charges. Also at the press briefing were representatives of the Commission for Religious Affairs (CRA), Andile Mngxitama of Black First Land First (BLF), Umkhonto we Sizwe Military Veterans Association (MKMVA) spokesman Carl Nieuhaus and National Funeral Practitioners

Association of South Africa Secretary General, Nkosentsha Shezi. All of those present have pledged their support for Zuma in the past under the #HandsOffZuma campaign.

They believe Zuma is being "persecuted" for working against a Westem capitalist agenda and for being propoor. They further contend the charges Zuma faces are politically motivated, making it impossible for him to have a fair trial. As they did for his first appearance, the group intends to hold night vigils for Zuma supporters. Tomorrow night, they will gather at King Dinuzulu Park from 7pm until 7am on Friday morning.

From there, they will march to Victoria Embankment "where we will gather outside the Durban High Court," said Bishop TB Ngcobo.

# **Jordan PM resigns**

JORDAN - Jordanian Prime Minister Hani Mulki resigned on Monday after he was summoned by King Abdullah II over growing protests against his government's austerity measures, a government source said."Prime Minister Hani Mulki submitted his resignation to the king this afternoon during a meeting at the Husseiniyeh Palace and the king accepted the resignation," the source told AFP. The king asked Education Minister Omar al-Razzaz to form a new government, the source added. Demonstrations have rocked the capital Amman and several other cities since last Wednesday after the government adopted a draft income tax law and announced new price hikes based on recommendations by the International Monetary Fund. AFP

## Finance minister to forfeit salary

JAPAN - Japan's Finance Minister and Deputy Prime Minister Taro Aso has volunteered to give up a year's salary in response to a cronyism scandal. The scandal involves the sale of state-owned land to a school operator that had ties to the wife of Prime Minister Shinzo Abe at a discount of about one-seventh of its value. In March, an investigation by the finance ministry found documents related to the sale were modified to remove the names of Abe, his wife, and Aso. "I am voluntarily returning 12 months of my salary as a Cabinet minister, as this problem has hurt public confidence in the finance ministry and the administration as a whole," Aso announced this week.



# Melania Trump makes first appearance after 24 days out of sight

WASHINGTON – First lady Melania Trump attended a White House event honouring Gold Star families on Monday in her first appearance in more than three weeks after a kidney procedure.

The first lady joined the president at a reception to honour families of those killed during military service. Out of respect for the families, the White House did not allow journalists to cover the event, meaning the first lady was seen in the flesh only by the families and administration officials who attended.

Others had to wait for photos and video to hit social media – and it didn't take long before that happened. Video posted on Twitter showed the first lady, who wore a black sleeveless dress, strolling into the East Room accompanied by President Donald Trump. The president showed her to a seat in the front row before he headed for the stage. It's the second year the Trumps have opened the White House to Gold Star families. The first lady said in a written statement after last

June's event that these families "are a unique and distinct category of individuals who should be cherished". Mrs Trump had not been seen in public since the overnight hours of May 10, when she and the president travelled to a Maryland military base to welcome home three Americans who had been released from captivity in North Korea. Four days later, the White

House announced that she had been hospitalised to treat a benign kidney condition. The closest first lady parallel to Mrs Trump's time out of the public spotlight is Bess Truman, who did few events as first lady because of discomfort around the media, said Anita McBride, a veteran of three Republican administrations who last served as chief of staff to first lady Laura Bush. *AFP* 

# Three arrested for child trafficking

UMUAHIA – Abia police command arrested members of three suspected child trafficking syndicates, including 17-year-old Gift Daniel, who sold her two-day-old baby boy for N670 000 (R23 000).

The police commissioner Anthony Ogbizi revealed this, while briefing journalists in Umuahia. Ogbizi said the command arrested at least 22 other suspected criminals following raids by officers in the wake of renewed criminal acts in different parts of the state. Speaking in an interview, Daniel said she was compelled to sell the baby due to financial difficulties.

# New deal struck in Libya

LIBYA - A new accord has been struck for thousands of displaced Libyans to return home to a town that sided with former leader Muammar Gaddafi in the 2011 revolution, the country's unity government said. Fayez al-Sarraj, Head of the Government of National Accord, welcomed the reconciliation deal signed late Sunday by representatives of the pro-Kadhafi town of Tawergha and nearby Misrata, 240km southeast of the Libyan capital Tripoli. *AFP* 

# US airstrike kills 27

JOHANNESBURG – The US military said it has carried out an airstrike in northern Somalia that killed 27 al-Shabaab extremists, AP reported. The statement issued Monday by the US Africa command said it assessed that no civilians were killed in the attack on Sunday south-west of Bosasso, the commercial capital of the semi-autonomous Puntland state. The area has recently seen attacks on local forces by extremists aligned with the Islamic State group.

# Mexican court orders new investigation into student massacre

MEXICO CITY – A court in Mexico has ordered a new probe into a crime that horrified the nation: the disappearance and suspected massacre of 43 pupils in 2014.

Relatives of the missing welcomed the ruling, but the government questioned it and said it was reviewing the decision, which came from a federal court in the state of Tamaulipas.

Mexico remains haunted by the unsolved mystery of the 43 pupils,

who vanished on 26 September 2014 in the southern city of Iguala after commandeering several buses to take them to a protest and then being attacked by local police.

Prosecutors initially said the officers delivered the teacher trainees to hitmen from the Guerreros Unidos drug cartel, who killed them, incinerated their bodies and dumped the remains in a river.

The remains of only one pupil were identified after a bone frag-

ment was found. But independent experts from the Inter-American Commission on Human Rights have rejected the government's conclusion. The court on Monday said the initial investigation was not "timely, effective, independent or impartial on the part of the attorney general's office," said the Federal Judiciary Council.

It said the case should be turned over to an independent truth commission. *Daily Mail*

# Tunisia keeper fakes injury to help players break Ramadan fast

LONDON - Tunisia's national goalkeeper appeared to feign injuries during World Cup practice matches so his teammates could break their Ramadan fasts.

Mouez Hassen went down early in the second half of Tunisia's games against Portugal and Turkey coinciding with sunset, which is when Ramadan fasting ends.

On both occasions his 'injury' prompted his teammates to rush to the sidelines to eat dates and drink water before taking to the field again.

During their first match against Portugal, Nice keeper Hassen went down in the 58th-minute with an 'injury'.

Just six minutes later, Tunisia - who are in England's group at the World Cup - scored and the game finished 2-2.

On Saturday against Turkey, Hassen lay flat on his back after a corner in the 49th-minute, allowing his team-mates to leave the pitch for food and water. He stayed down for around a minute. That match also finished 2-2.

Tunisian sports reporters were the first to point out that Hassen's injuries both

coincided with sunset, which is when Iftar - or the breaking of the fast - begins.

Freelance reporter Souhail Khmira tweeted that there is 'an agreement' between the players and their goalkeeper to break their fast in this way.

It does not appear that Turkey, another mostly Muslim nation, had any such arrangement in place when they played

Tunisia.

Hassen has since been teased on Twitter, including by fellow footballer Chaker Alhadhur, who joked: "It's all right now, we know you were pretending."

In response, Hassen tweeted 'I was injured bruv' alongside laughing emo-JIS.

Hassen was not punished during either game by the on-field officials, and is unlikely to face any subsequent punishment because proving the injury was not genuine is virtually impossible.

The Tunisian football federation has yet to comment on the timing of the two injury breaks.

Hundreds of millions of Muslims around the world are observing Ramadan at the moment. It is a month of self-discipline where Muslims refrain from eating, drinking, smoking and having sex from sunrise to sunset.

The Quran demands that 'whosoever of you is present, let him fast the month' but makes exceptions, adding: "Whosoever of you is sick or on a journey, a number of other days."

TURIN - Holland scored late to hold 10-man Italy to 1-1 in a friendly in Turin.

Nathan Ake headed in two minutes from time to cancel out Simone Zaza's opener.

Italy played the final 21 minutes a man down after defender Domenico Criscito was harshly sent off for a poor last-man tackle. Both teams, which used to be powerhouses of football, failed to qualify for the World Cup and it was not hard to see why.

Although Italy created the better of the chances it floundered in front of goal, while the Holland struggled to muster a shot on target until late in the match.

It was Roberto Mancini's third match in charge of Italy after a victory against Saudi Arabia last week and a defeat to France.

"It's too early at the moment to see something," Mancini said. "We have to begin playing the youngsters, the ones who have less experience. "The guys put a lot of effort in, after a hard year. We have to sort out a lot of things, but I am optimistic." Mancini changed 10 of the 11 players who started Friday's friendly in Nice, keeping only Jorginho. Lorenzo Insigne became the first Napoli player to captain Italy. The Azzurri thought they scored within three minutes but Andrea Belotti's strike was ruled out for offside.

Italy had the better of the chances in a bright first half for the home side but wasted opportunities, notably when Belotti fired straight at Holland goalkeeper Jasper Cillessen from point-blank range.

Criscito's header was also cleared off the line by Ruud Vormer with Cillessen beaten. Holland upped the pressure in the second half but Italy took the lead in the 67th after Federico Chiesa crossed in from the right for fellow substitute Zaza to slide in and fire into the bottom left corner. ing legal action it was joining other sports bodies, including European football confederation UEFA, which has previously taken Viagogo to court.

With the World Cup set to kick off in just nine days, FIFA also warned fans to stay clear of any "unauthorised transfer and/or resale of tickets."

It also said that anyone with a ticket that can be traced to an authorised resale

"FIFA reminds all fans that FIFA.com/tickets is the only official and legitimate website on which to buy 2018 FIFA World Cup tickets," the statement further said.

Viagogo describes itself as "a global online platform for live sport, music and entertainment tickets," that aims to "helps ticket sellers ranging from individuals with a spare ticket to large multinational event organisers reach a global audience."

According to the Guardian newspaper, it was set up by the people behind StubHub, the American secondary ticket online giant widely used by sports fans in North America.

Karius, who was at fault for two of Real Madrid's goals in the 3-1 defeat, underwent scans at the weekend amid fears he sustained head trauma.

Liverpool's concerns arose from the 24-year-old's collision with Sergio Ramos in the second half of the game.

A matter of minutes later, his attempt to throw the ball out rebounded off Karim Benzema into the net to put Real Madrid ahead.

Karius blundered again late on

when he parried Gareth Bale's longrange shot into the net to make it

Liverpool's medical team were concerned by Karius' welfare and arranged for him to visit Dr Ross Zafonte at the Massachusetts General Hospital during his holiday to the United States of America.

Zafonte assessed the results and has deemed that the German did suffer concussion as a result of Ramos' challenge.

The top doc released a statement, which read: "We have received numerous calls today regarding the health status of Liverpool goalkeeper Loris Karius.

"With Mr. Karius's permission, we are providing information about his medical situation in an effort to prevent, where possible, the dissemination of incomplete or erroneous information.

"On May 31, Mr. Karius underwent a comprehensive examination by Dr. Ross Zafonte and Dr. Lenore Herget in Boston at Massachusetts General Hospital and Spaulding Rehabilitation Hospital.

# Russia cherishing 2018 soccer World Cup cheer

VELIKY NOVGOROD -Halfway between Moscow and Saint Petersburg in a city abandoned by time, the ball pings across the slushy snow as boys emulate the stars who will shine at the 2018 World Cup.

More than a thousand years old, Veliky Novgorod has followed the fate of many other historic Russian cities, losing its lustre and burdened by the grim realities of provincial life. But social problems seem that

little bit less important as the world's most celebrated sports event approaches, filling abandoned corners of Russia with the thrill of the beautiful game.

Watchful parents are bundled up in parkas while their children zip around a fenced-in courtyard stripped down to their sweatshirts and woolly hats, elastic scarves around their necks. The fence is made of



steel beams covered in peeling rust, painful to bounce off of and emblematic of the life of hard knocks Veliky Novgorod has endured since the Soviet Union's fall.

Yet the focus here is squarely on football, which in the northern Russian springtime is played by children in conditions more suitable to skiing.

The boys come prepared. They split up into teams, dressed in

jerseys with numbers on their backs. Each has his own pair of football boots, some new and some worn, which surprisingly maintain a solid grip on the mix of snow and ice packed tightly into the ground.

A deep-blue sky above and decrepit apartment blocks around them, the boys hop, skip and dream - each conjuring up a fantasy of playing in a World Cup of their own. *AFP*

# Mom begs Cele to put Pirates star in jail

But the police appear to be dragging their feet in effecting the arrest of the man who was also the mixologist at a family lunch before the alleged incident.

The victim's mother, who cannot be named to protect the identity of the girl, opened a case of statutory rape against

the soccer ace at the Olievenhoutbosch Police Station last Monday - after the child's school teacher informed her of the alleged incident.

In an interview with Sunday World, the girl's mother said: "They [police] took my child for medical tests but I was not happy with certain questions they asked her. I think I failed my daughter, I should have been there to protect her," she said in tears. The mother said the striker forcefully kissed her daughter last year and this traumatised her.

"I had to take her to a psychologist for counselling. I asked her to press a sexual harassment case against him but she was not willing to do so and the psychologist implored me to not force her to do so. According to the girl's affidavit, seen by Sunday World, the schoolgirl had gone to Centurion with her mother to have lunch at her grandmother's house. She said that the player, who is dating one of the daughters of an aunt, arrived and offered her alcohol which she rejected. Sowetan Live

"Now he just seems to be a bit unhappy, down and dour. That's totally the opposite to when he first came over and his team performances reflect that.

"It's a shame. If he just lightened up a bit and had a sense of humour then the team would reflect it.

"There'd be a lighter step in the dressing room and on the pitch.

"You'd see it in the performances. At the moment performances just seem to be slow. "Rival teams are too knowledgeable and organised for you to play that way.

"You look at other successful teams this year - Tottenham, Manchester City and Liverpool - they all play disruptive quick football and teams can't get a grip on them." Mourinho wasn't afraid to criticise his players publicly during the last campaign.

England international Luke Shaw was singled out by the Portuguese on more than one occasion. Sharpe says he sometimes clashed with Sir Alex Ferguson but had huge respect for the Scot. The former midfielder isn't convinced the current crop of United stars have the same reverence for Mourinho.

He added: "A few of us - myself included - didn't always see eye to eye with Sir Alex Ferguson.

"But one thing you did have was a respect for him. Whenever we did have an issue with each other it was always kept behind closed doors and in the dressing room. Daily Mail



With only nine minutes into the match watched by over 100 spectators, Botswana opened the scorers chart, much against the run of play. They scored via the boot of Orapa United striker Onkabetse Makgantai, who blasted home a Kabelo Seakanyang pass to beat the helpless Sandanezwe Mathabela at Sihlangu goals.

Sihlangu could not pose any form of threat to the opposition until the half hour mark when Felix 'Fela' Badenhorst, who was named Man of the Match, saw his header go over the crossbar from a Tony 'TT' Tsabedze cross.

The former Manzini Wanderers mentor gave a run to Sanele Mkhweli, Bonginkhosi 'Manyovu' Dlamini Zweli 'Mlilo' Nxumalo and Musa Dlamini but at the end, it counted for nothing.

The second half saw Sihlangu

returning an improved team but again they failed to make clear cut chances.

'Milo' was unfortunate not to level matters in the 71st minute when his effort went narrowly wide following a good interchange of passes with 'TT'.
