Siphofaneni records highest rainfall

SIPHOFANENI recorded the highest rainfall when compared to the other areas of the country.

The rainfall recordings were extracted from the rains that started on Tuesday morning until yesterday morning.

Siphotaneni recorded 38.0mm tol-

lowed by Nsoko with 30.5 mm while Mhlume came third with a recording of 27.8 mm.

The aforementioned areas are all in the Lubombo region.

"The Lubombo and Hhohho regions seem to be recording more rainfall since the past week," said the forecaster.

Last week, Siteki and Mbabane recorded 25.5 and 21.5mm, respectively, which

was the highest when compared to the other areas.

Mananga also in the Lubombo region, Matsapha, and KaLanga recorded average rains. They recorded 27.2mm, 26.5 mm and 23.5mm, respectively.

Motshane, an area in the Hhohho region next to Nkoyoyo, received the lowest rain as it recorded 6.0 mm.

5 MONTHS LATER LATE VICTOR SHABANGU STILL NOT BURIED

ONE would have expected former **Eswatini Sports Council Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Victor** Shabangu to be resting in peace in his grave by now.

However, five months down the line, his body is still in the morgue.

This came after the late former CEO's mother Joyce Nsibandze filed an appeal application after the High Court had ordered that the deceased's father Pitoli should bury him at Moneni.

Another application was filed at the High Court before Judge John Magagula who handed down the original judgment that the deceased should be buried at Moneni. When the matter was supposed to be heard yesterday,

When the matter was supposed to be heard yesterday, Judge Magagula stated that the court is now functus officio (can no longer hear the matter) as he handed down judgment and ruled that the deceased be buried at Moneni

The late former sports administrator's body is still kept at Dups Funeral Home while the battle for his corpse rages on.

Ordered

Judge Magagula in the judgment challenged by Joyce ordered that Victor's body should be buried at

But Joyce filed an appeal immediately after the ruling. Pitoli made it clear that he was hurting that his son's body is being kept at the morgue instead of being buried.

He blamed Victor's mother for making unfounded allegations by stating that Ngculwini is Victor's place.

Shabangu said this is far from the truth as the deceased built the place

He said Victor cannot be buried where his children are not welcome.

While Sibandze had initially successfully filed an application to stop the funeral, Victor's father also moved an application at the High Court where Judge Magagula ruled in his favour.

Pitoli, among other prayers, sought an order directing the University of Eswatini (where Victor was employed) to process all claims

lodged by Nomvuyo Shabangu (nee Kunene). Nomvuyo is the same woman whom Joyce claimed was not the rightful wife of t h e

deceased as their marriage allegedly ended. In his application, Pitoli alleged that Joyce was refusing with all the required documents to process the claim, hence a court order compelling her was necessary.

The applicant (Pitoli) further sought an order restraining and interdicting Joyce from removing Victor's body from Dups Funeral Home Crematorium, pending finalisation of the matter.

Respondents in the matter are the University of Eswatini, Joyce and Dups Home Crematorium.

In his court application filed under a certificate of urgency, Pitoli had stated that on June 16, 2018 his son Victor collapsed and died in Manzini. He stated that the deceased resided with him from a very young age up until he completed Form

Four and when he was doing Form Five, he went to stay with Joyce. Pitoli alleged that he did all the duties a father did for his child and paid for his education from primary to high school.

Another Christmas in jail for suspended cop 'Waga'

SUSPENDED police officer Musa 'Waga' Kunene, whose bail application was dismissed by the High Court and the Supreme Court, will spend yet another Christmas in jail as his trial could not proceed yesterday morning.

Kunene, who was suspended from the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) following his initial arrest after being charged with theft by false pretences, left the court dejected as the matter was postponed to February 2019.

The matter was before High Court Judge Cyril Maphanga yesterday and the Crown represented by Ayanda Matsenjwa has lined up a list of witnesses to be paraded before court.

The suspended officer is facing charges of theft by false pretences that were preferred against him last year while he was out on bail for other criminal

Kunene, who was out on bail for other offences, was re-arrested for allegedly stealing money by false pretences from another woman, an incident that allegedly happened in Mbabane.

High Court Judge Ticheme Dlamini in July last year dismissed Kunene's urgent application noting that the applicant (Kunene) had been granted bail

by the court twice for other offences and was appearing before court for the third time for yet another bail application on a new charge.

All the charges that he is facing, according to the court, are still pending and Judge Dlamini had stated that he was satisfied that his release on bail would now undermine the criminal justice system as well as the public confidence in it as it would be erod-

Justice

The court stated that it was no longer in the interest of justice that Kunene be admitted to bail and accordingly issued an order that his bail application be dismissed. He filed an appeal

application at the Supreme Court which was also dismissed it as it held that it was not in the best interest of justice to grant him another bail and held that the High Court rightly refused him

Kunene was arrested by the Mbabane police on July 6, 2017 and was subsequently charged with theft by false pretences in that he allegedly stole money amounting to E130 000 from another woman through misrepresentation. During his first appearance at the Magistrate's Court, the Crown indicated that his bail is opposed as he is out on a similar charge.

The Crown, represented by Bonsile Ndlela at the Magistrate's Court, had submitted that it would not have been in the interest of justice to admit Kunene to bail since the public's confidence in the justice system and bail system itself would be undermined.

Ndlela also submitted that the applicant had breached bail conditions that had been issued by the Supreme Court when admitting him to bail under case number 03/16 and submitted that the condition of the bail states that the applicant should not commit any criminal offence during the period that he is out on bail.

Kunene, however, breached that condition, hence the Crown applied that he should be kept in custody as contemplated in terms of Section 96(8) (c) of the CP&E Act.

PASTOR FINED E2 000 FOR DRUNK-DRIVING

REGRET was written on the face of a senior pastor from one of the well-established churches in Siteki as he appeared before the Magistrate's Court after he was nabbed for drink-driving.

Paul Mabaso (61) appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso where he faced a charge of contravening Section 122 of the Road Traffic Act 6 of 2007.

The generally humbled man of God is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully driven a motor vehicle while under the influence of an intoxicating substance.

He was nabbed near Mpaka, along the Manzini-Simunye road.

When he was subjected to a breathalyser test, a content of alcohol reading of 0.89 mg/l was detected in his system. This is way above the legal limit, which stands at 0.37 mg/l.

Particulars of the offence included that the accused person also drove his vehicle in a negligent manner and hit another vehicle from behind. He is said to have struggled to maintain his balance, and had a strong smell of alcohol coming from his mouth.

When he was informed of his rights to legal representation, the accused person elected to conduct his own defence in the matter.

He pleaded guilty to the charge. His plea was also accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the

During mitigation, the pastor pleaded with the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying he was a first time offender. He further told the court that he was unemployed and had no source of income.

The pastor asked the court to defer payment of his fine to at least end of November.

He was accordingly found guilty by the court and was sentenced to four months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000

The court extended its leniency and allowed Mabaso to pay the fine in two instalments, starting from the end of November.

Rumours started circulating that she was hospitalised after losing at the first phase of the elections, something that she refuted.


She confirmed applying for the position which comes with an estimated salary of E13 000 when contacted yesterday.

ONS HOPE PM TALKS ABOUT 6.5%

PUBLIC sector associations (PSAs) expect the CoLA issues (6.5% pay rise) to be addressed when they meet with the Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini tomorrow.

The PSAs are supposed to meet with the PM tomorrow at the Cabinet offices situated at the Hospital Hill in Mbabane.

Some of the PSAs leaders, when called on the agenda of the meeting, stated that they were blank.

The leaders told this publication that they were told that this was a courtesy call extended by the prime minister to them as PSAs. They said they did not know what the agenda could be, except that they thought thorny issues affecting them would be

He stated that over the past few weeks, they did not have a government in place, so they hoped that the PM wants to meet them to find out how they were coping in their respective places of work.

Anxious

Sibiva likened the civil servants to children who had been at home without their parents. He said children in such situations would be anxious about the whereabouts of their parents, mainly because they would have nothing to eat.

When the parents arrive home, he said, they normally want to

find out how the children have been coping in their absence.

Sibiya said the situation they were in with the prime minister was exactly the same. "Tsine besisolo sisodvwa babe wetfu angekho. Besigadze kutsi utasiphatsela kona ngemaswidi. Emaswidi etfu nguCoLA. (We are in a situation where we were alone, without our father. Now that our father is here, we expect sweets and CoLA in this case represents the sweets)," Sibiya said.

Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) President Mbongwa Dlamini was also of the view that the meeting tomorrow would address the thorny issues that disturbed them in their line of work as public servants.

He stated that he did not know why the prime minister called them, but thought issues surrounding CoLA would be discussed.

He said there were other issues that affected them at work but all would be discussed tomorrow during the meeting.

New minister to decide on bus 25% fares hike

THE council governing public transport in the country has forwarded its request for a bus fares hike to the ministry of public works and transport.

According to the President of the council, Sihlangu Nhlabatsi, the request to endorse a hike was forwarded to the responsible ministry last week.

However, the ministry told them they were going to attend to the endorsement request as soon as the new Cabinet ministers had assumed office. The new Minister is Chief Ndlaluhlaza.

"The director assured us that they were going to attend to our request soon," he said. Nhlabatsi said he was hoping that their request would be attended soon because the Cabinet ministers have been introduced to their respective offices. The fares hike request has been motivated by the recent fuel hike and the increase of Value Added Tax (VAT) from 14 to 15 per cent. If the ministry approves the endorsement of the 25 per cent hike, it will mean that it will cost E23.50 for the Mbabane/Manzini route.

The increment was approved by members of the 10th Parliament, however, it was not gazetted. Meanwhile, the director responsible in the ministry of works and public transport could not be sort for comment due to the fact that his phone rang unanswered yesterday.

TUCOSWA not invited for now

TUCOSWA is not invited to the meeting of PSAs with Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini.

The Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) is a mother body of three of the four PSAs that are supposed to take part in tomorrow's meeting with the premier. Swaziland National

Association of Teachers (SNAT), Swaziland Nurses Association (SNA), Swaziland National Association of Civil Servants (SNACS), and the Swaziland National Association of Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP) are the organisations that are supposed to take part in the meeting. TUCOSWA, as a federation, is also a mother body to other unions in other sectors like textile and manufacturing industries. TUCOSWA Deputy Secretary Muzi Mhlanga yesterday confirmed that they were not invited to the meeting as TUCOSWA.

He stated, however, that they were still to confirm whether they would be allowed to be part of the meeting or not, as the labour commissioner was still to confirm that for them. However, he stated that the invitation letter was solely for the PSAs, so those would definitely be part of the meeting.

Public Service Principal Secretary (PS) Evart Madlopha said he did not know what the agenda of the meeting

He said he was only sent to tell the leaders of the PSAs that the prime minister was interested in meeting them. But he was not told what the meeting would be about.

Madlopha was told to facilitate the meeting as someone who was part of the Government Negotiating Team (GNT), which usually met the PSAs whenever there were salary issues that were to be discussed.

Efforts to get a response from the prime minister's office could not yield positive fruits. He requested an SMS to be sent to him, but there was no response at the time of compiling this

THE time has come for staff members of the deputy prime minister's office (DPMO) to rope in chiefs in their programmes.

This was said by Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Themba Masuku yesterday when he was introduced to the staff members of the DPMO. The staff came from as far as Sicunusa, Pigg's Peak, Lavumisa, Siteki, among other areas, to meet the DPM.

Masuku said he was happy to meet the workers, who had crammed the conference room of the DPMO, to greet their political principal. The workers expressed happiness to meet Masuku because they got a rare opportunity to interact with him.

The DPM told the workers

that they had to stop using state-of-the-art facilities in urban areas when they implemented their development programmes.

They should go to the chiefdoms and involve the people who were living in those areas.

"In my time as the Regional Administrator in Shiselweni, I learned that you should include chiefs in implementing these programmes because they will only have an impact when the people are involved.

Incidents

Whenever you are commemorating certain incidents, go to the people in chiefdoms and tell them to take part so that they feel part of the programmes," Masuku said.

The DPM further told the staff members that money or status of working at DPMO should not be their priority. Their priority should be to serve the nation, he said.

FORMER Swazi Observer Editor-in-Chief Musa Ndlangamandla was vesterday summoned at the police station adjacent to Mater Dolorosa High School for questioning.

Ndlangamandla, who was later allowed to leave, was questioned on incidents that allegedly took place in 2011.

This is the same year his office was raided by police who confiscated his computer but was later returned. Ndlangamandla confirmed the summon and questioning by the police in a long Facebook post yesterday afternoon. "They asked me if I had talked to political leaders of the country's opposition groups. I told them that I am a journalist and

that if they could familiarise themselves with what journalists do they would find that our job is to talk to people and write articles about the truth and anything that is of public interest. I told them that in my 20 years as a journalist, I have and continue to speak to all Swazı people regardless of their political affiliation. I told them I speak to PUDEMO stalwart Mario Masuku and ultra conservatives like Prince Masitsela at any time," he said. Ndlangamandla said these people belonged to Eswatini and they had a right and a stake in how the country is run.

When sought for comment, Police Information and Communications Officer (PICO) Phindile Vilakati confirmed that Ndlangamandla was asked to assist the police investigate a matter that she could not divulge.







HANDS OFF GOVT'S MONEY - CRUISER

MINISTER of Tinkhundla Administration and Development David 'Cruiser' Ngcamphalala says his first work in the ministry will be working on Sibaya recommendations.

These included the introduction of tinkhundla administration and development syllabus to all educational systems, decentralisation of Tinkhundla service centres at constituency level.

He said most Emaswati at the recent Sibaya questioned why Tinkhundla did not provide services such as travel document registration.

Ngcamphalala said during Sibaya, nearly 80 per cent of the issues raised were directed to his ministry.

The minister said they had until August next year to produce a booklet about the ministry which would contain a roadmap.

He was speaking yesterday at the ministry's offices while being introduced to the staff. "During Sibaya sessions, the ministry was given a target of August 2019, meaning by this time next year, the ministry is expected to have tackled all the Sibaya recommendations," he said. Ngcamphalala said the ministry's staff members would first be workshopped where solutions for the recommendations would be brainstormed, including the implementation of the Tinkhundla document. On issues to tackle, the minister said the issue of corruption was amongst the issues that are required to be eliminated as mentioned by the Prime Minister Ambrose Dlamini. He said working on

the Sibaya recommendations does not mean that the ministry would abandon their pipeline projects. "Government officials should stay away from government's money because that will definitely draw the authority's attention towards you,' he said. Ngcamphalala said every employee should take it to heart that the communities out there yearned for the ministry's help. "The ministry will work on existing projects, plan, consult and implement the Sibaya recommendations. We will work tirelessly in improving the ministry and further work closely with other ministries," he said. He further highlighted that the ministry is the core of the country's government and that if Tinkhundla work according to their mandate, the country would reach 2022 without any trends of corruptions.

OFFICIALS REGISTER GRIEVANCES TO MINISTER

MEANWHILE, officials from the Ministry of tinkhundla administration and development did not hesitate to forward their sympathies to the minister.

They labelled the ministry as 'dead' which required excessive work to bring it to life.

The Programme Officer for Capacity Building and Decentralisation, Amos Maziya said he hoped that Ngcamphalala's arrival would impact the ministry positively.

He mentioned that some projects especially the decentralisation department, was for almost eight years denied the opportunities to bring the development and services to the people.

"It is a pity that even the ministry itself has no clue of its mandate, which is bringing development to the people, especially those in the rural areas. We are hoping that your arrival minister will change things for the better," he said.

He said some funds that are budgeted for decentralisation projects are diverted to other projects.

Maziya said they resorted on doing some projects on the side, including the construction of service centres under government constituencies.

Moreover, Shiselweni Regional Secretary Ngcayizivele Dlamini

said the ministry allegedly only submitted two documents in Parliament in a period of five years. He added that the ministry's staff members were also caught up in an audit chaos which he said might have contributed to the poor performance by the ministry. The RS mentioned that they would spend nights in the office while undergoing those audits. Dlamini pledged that the staff would support the minister in implementing all planned projects and help move it to the right direction.

Victorious soldiers over Sobantu still not compensated

THE three soldiers who were dismissed from the army and successfully filed an application against Army Commander Sobantu Dlamini to be reinstated or paid their terminal benefits have still not been paid.

With the Eswatini Umbutfo Defence Force (EUDF) Commander Sobantu Dlamini in continued defiance with an order of court, the three have since taken the matter back to court where they are seeking an order of court to force the commander to adhere to its order

A pre-trial conference has already been held at the High Court and according to minutes attached to the filing notice, the estimated duration of trial is one day and notice of set down is three weeks from the date of pre-trial conference which was on October 8, 2018.

Nkosikayikhethi Nxumalo and two other soldiers Mpendulo Mngometulu and Vusimuzi Hlatjwako have filed the application at the High Court after realising that the defiant army commander has refused to reinstate or compensate them as per the court order.

According to papers filed at the High Court, the commander defied a court order after the High Court set aside the dismissal of the three and a letter requesting salary activation into the government system was forwarded.

Following the High Court order, the commander noted an appeal at the Supreme Court and when the matter was heard, the Supreme Court dismissed the application by the army commander who still refused to reinstate the three.

However, despite further letters written to the principal secretary in the ministry of defence (MOD) and the attorney general (AG) requesting that the army complies with the orders of court, Dlamini did not reinstate the three and terminated their services from the EUDF.

It is for that reason that Nxumalo and the two have now approached the court in terms of Legal Notice Number 165 of 2011 and dated October 18, 2011 as they want the army to pay them on 60 years retirement age scale.

According to the application, the army also has to pay them salary arrears as Nxumalo in his papers argues that some soldiers who were fired in the army were paid their terminal benefits.

There three were arrested after being accused of fuel theft in the army but were cleared by the courts after the matter was heard. However, they were later dismissed after appearing before the army Court Marshall as allegedly ordered by the commander. Cited as the respondents in the matter are the commander, Mashikilisane Fakudze,

Deputy Commander Jeffrey Tshabalala, Principal Secretary in the MoD Andreas Mathabela, government, attorney general, Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Public Service Evart Madlopha and the Public Service Pensions Fund.

Also attached to the application is the applicants' discovery affidavit where Nxumalo details every move taken in the court processes and correspondences with the concerned parties. The matter is yet to be allocated for trial in court. Representing the three soldiers in the matter is Mafutseni based lawyer Leo Ndvuna Dlamini of S.A Nkosi Attorneys while the respondents are represented by attorney Vusi Kunene.

Girl (6) raped last year, suffers cervical pains to date

A six-year-old girl of Lundzi has reportedly developed cervical problems after a neighbour allegedly sexually assaulted her with a finger.

Thabo Nkambule (15) is alleged to have on numerous occasions tried to penetrate the girl before using a finger as he failed. This gruesome incident allegedly happened last year June 16. The perpetrator has not been arrested, while the survivor suffers the effects of the rape. Sources claimed that the perpetrator had long nails which ended up bruising the girl's vaginal and cervical areas. The survivor's mother is an employee of one of the area's forestry companies. It is said the young girl usually seeks refuge at her neighbour's place when she knocks off from school while her mother is still at work. When the mother fetched the child however, on that fateful day, she found her bleeding from her virginal area and the child just wept when questioned. The mother is said to

have hastily travelled to the nearby police station and then the clinic to seek help for her child. "The matter became a problem from the onset because the mother stayed in the clinic for days without the child getting relevant care for her situation," said the source. The girl is said to be currently bleeding and has difficulty when urinating due to the wounds sustained from the assault. Meanwhile, Save the Children Child Protection Officer, Thabo Magagula said they were shocked because both the survivor and perpetrator are children. Magagula labelled the act as monstrous and inhumane. "Where exactly is a safe place for our children, especially a girl child, if gruesome violations like this are endured by them while at home?, he said, adding that he has worked for years on children matters but this one was something else. Magagula pleaded with relevant officials to speedily act on the matter to the interest of the affected child Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said there was a similar matter that the police were investigating.

Perpetrator classified mentallly ill

THE survivor's mother said the perpetrator's mother claimed that his son will never do such a despicable thing because he has mental illnesses and epilepsy.

She said she discovered that her daughter complained of severe pains while trying to urinate. She said what pained her most is the fact that her child's attacker was never

arrested and her child endured severe pains daily. "My child's life has been destroyed, she sleeps during school hours and she is no longer able to 'hold' urine," she said.

The mother alleged that the child's attacker 'bribed' her with five fat cakes to keep quite. She said she has been in and out of hospitals with donated funds trying to find help for her child.

COPS SHOOT DEAD CHICKEN THIEF WHO KILLED SOLDIER

THE man accused of killing Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) member Chester Dlamini was on Tuesday 'hunted' and gunned down by the police as he failed to cooperate.

Mapunapuna Hlophe, the man from Magele near Hlatikulu had earlier on on the same day killed Dlamini and ran off.

It is said the police comprising members of the serious crime unit (Lukhozi) descended at Magele after learning about the murder of the soldier. Dlamini had responded to an alarm from residents after Hlophe had allegedly tried to cause trouble in another neighbour's home where he allegedly attempted to steal chickens. He was a known troublemaker in the community.

It is said in the early hours of Wednesday, Hlophe was caught in the act and when residents attempted to apprehend him, he fled and this happened after he had injured one of the residents who he had allegedly stabbed with a sharp object.

The injured resident had to be rushed to the Hlatikulu Government Hospital by Dlamini who then later decided to arm himself and search for Hlophe.

Hlophe realised that Dlamini was looking for him, it is said he hid inside banana trees.

Stone

It is said Hlophe picked a stone and hit him hard and as he hit the ground, he (Hlophe) then disarmed him and killed him straightaway. After killing Dlamini, it is said he fled with his firearm and a search for him ensued with police also joined by the residents. Just after 1700 hours yesterday, police got a tip off that Hlophe was spotted at an area known as Kowane which is a zone also under Magele. Police are said to have then proceeded to the said area and knowing that Hlophe was armed with the soldier's gun, they came prepared.

It is said they (police) ordered Hlophe to surrender, but he would not cooperate and that was when the police after firing warning shots and seeing him failing to surrender, were left with no option but shoot him.

"He failed to surrender when police advised him to do so and they shot him dead," said a community member.

An elder in the community who is part of the ruling household at Magele, Mlamuli Dlamini claimed to have heard the news that Hlophe who was being sought for murdering a soldier had also been killed.

"I just got the news that police have killed the man who had also killed the soldier. I am told his body is also at the mortuary as we speak," he said.

CANGO assigns new govt

THE Coordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations (CANGO) says government's reform agenda should focus on diversifying the revenue base, protecting and improving quality and efficiency of spending.

CANGO in an expectation letter addressed to the new government said the budget deficit for the financial year 2017 and 2018 is contingent on the passage of newly identified revenue measures proposed on the Finance Bill of 2018.

CANGO said government was faced with a delicate choice between the need to limit future spending increases so as to bring the fiscal deficit under control, and to ensure a return to robust economic growth through structural increase in public spending.

"There is need for the country to widen the tax base and allow for proper policies that can project better economic growth. Due to the volatile nature of the Southern African Customs Union (SACU) receipts, eco-tourism, events such as Bushfire can boost the economy significantly through tourism," it said

It further recommended that the new government should adjust the elderly grant, increase the Orphaned Vulnerable Children (OVCs) education grant, and revise the OVC grant. CANGO said there is a great need to adjust the elderly grant to go above E461 per month.

It added that government should increase the non-wage share of the budget towards secondary education for the construction of computer and science laboratories and libraries.

Upgrading of teaching skills periodically to allow a curriculum that is aligned to a rapidly changing and fast paced environment was suggested to the new government.

Inventory

Meanwhile, CANGO said government should undertake an inventory of the health sector and look at effective means to improve efficiency and equity in the spending of the health sector.

"Increase operational and capital equipment procurement to allow for purchase of mobile facilities that can access hard to reach areas of the country. Adopting cost efficient procurement systems of vaccines and drugs to limit the periodic shortage of drugs."

The current policy framework in the mining sector, CANGO said does not make comprehensive policy provisions to address environmental and health protection.

Policies

As a result, government must first change policies in the mining sector, for instance, licenses should be issued to Emaswati and foreigners should come in as partners.

Other recommendations

Personnel should be trained and dispatched throughout the country to assist with explanations and effective implementation of the VAT policy.

The Government of Eswatini VAT approach and policy directive policy should allow participation from interest groups (such as the Federation of Swaziland Employers and Chamber of Commerce (FSE and CC) to get their views and clear areas of misunderstanding regarding VAT should there be any.

Government should provide incentives for private sector to participate in or provide Early Childhood

Care and Education (ECCE) especially tax breaks and parcels of land and or any other means.

There is need to look at means to incentivise teachers for best performing schools and explore ways to develop infrastructure of schools set in rural areas to allow for effective student learning environment.

Attempts should also be made to ensure that communities benefit from mining activity through sustainable measures and not the typical Corporate Social Investment (CSI) programmes.

Citizens or communities should be afforded an opportunity to shape policy and CSI through participation and sensitisation to mining policies

Review agricultural policies and address challenges to expansion in agriculture; Policies have to be reviewed to ascertain that they facilitate large-scale agricultural production.

Government of Eswatini must also empower industry stakeholders such as government, civil society, private sector, parliament and media to identify, prioritise and implement actions that promote accountability and transparency in the industry.

Shoplifter found guilty despite having concealed evidence

A shoplifter who was suspected to have concealed evidence by burning his jacket whilst in police holding cells has been fined E1 000 despite the unavailability of evidence.

The allegations that shoplifting suspect David Sithole had burnt his jacket were disclosed by Constable Zakhele Dlamini when testifying against the accused at the national court yester-

day

The jacket in question is said to have been stuffed with six tyre polish items which were stolen by the accused from Shoprite at the Swazi Plaza in Mbabane.

He was caught by security personnel from the store who then handed him over to the Royal Eswatini Police (REP) at the Swazi Plaza police post. Constable Dlamini said the suspect's hands were tied with a rope when he was handed over to them by the security guards.

Sithole is said to have elected to

remain silent when being questioned regarding the stolen items.

He informed the court that the items which he is alleged to have stolen were retrieved from a shopping basket not from a jacket.

He was adamant that he had gone to the store to purchase the items and refuted ever wearing a jacket on the said day.

Sithole who was dressed in a black shirt, informed Court President Chief officer Lembelele Dlamini that the morning before court, police tried forcing him to put on a jacket whichdid not belong to him.

However, those efforts failed as he instinctively resisted their offer. He claimed to have had a feeling that he was being set up by the police hence he never accepted the jacket.

The court after taking all factors into consideration found the accused person guilty.

The court made it clear before passing sentence that it would not be showing any mercy to the accused. He was then handed a fine of E1 000 or 12 months in a correctional facility.



20-year-old woman arrested for abandoning baby with 'gogo'

A 20-year-old woman has been arrested after dumping a two-month-old baby with her grandmother for two weeks.

Bagezile Dlamini neglected the baby for about two weeks and was found drinking at Siyabonga Bar in the company of her new boyfriend. The accused was slapped with the charge of contravening the Child Protection and Welfare Act. According to the charge sheet, Dlamini abandoned her baby with a 70-year-old woman who is her grandmother. It is alleged that the accused left the child without any diapers, clothes and food, thus exposing the child to health hazards.

She appeared at the Manzini Magistrate's Court yesterday before Magistrate Nelsiwe Hlophe. She pleaded guilty to the charge.

Abandon

Narrating what led her to abandon her own baby, the accused informed the court that she had broken up with the father of the child after he denied paternity of the child. She said after she gave birth, she fell in love with another boyfriend who promised to support her child. However it later surfaced that the accused was still seeing the biological father of the child and in the two weeks when she had abandoned the baby she also visited him.

When asked why she was still in contact with the father of the child who had denied paternity of the child and was refusing to support the baby, the accused person informed the court that it is because she still had feelings for him.

When asked if she was sure about the paternity of the child. The accused person informed the court that she was sure as she slept with him during a party and they were both drunk and did not use protection on that day.

The crown stated that the offence committed by the accused was a serious one and that she failed to explain why she abandoned her child, but instead told the court about her escapades with other boyfriends.

The accused was remanded back into police custody until November 16, for judgement.

MATSAPHA CTA RUNS OUT OF DIESEL

GOVERNMENT cars were yesterday grounded at the central transport administration (CTA), Matsapha branch as the department had reportedly ran out of diesel.

It is said the fuel shortage affected essential departments like the police, health, fire and emergency services. The shortage was experienced at CTA Matsapha garage only. It is said there was no diesel from as early as 9am.

When reporters from this publication arrived at the garage, there was a notice written 'NO DIESEL'.

Most of the vehicles that were on the queue were government's rented cars, some which are used by police officers to transport examination papers and police officers to schools in the duration of the external exams. However, there were other government cars that included those from health, and home affairs and others. "We have been here since morning, we came from as far as Mhlume," said



one of the officers who preferred to speak on condition of anonymity. Another government driver, who was driving a Toyota Quantum, said there was no diesel, adding that vehicles using such fuel were grounded.

"Now we have to rush to other garages fill to up," he said. Meanwhile, Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Public Works and Transport, Makhosini Mndzawe when contacted said fuel shortage would not be experienced in the long term as the situation would soon be sorted.

He said this happened in all their garages and usually the situation only lasts for a couple of hours.

"This is a cycle to cycle, diesel gets used up and we order more, and it is usually delivered the same day or the next," he said.



MALARIA CASES HAVE DROPPED

EFFORTS towards fighting malaria seem to be heading to the right direction, as there is a huge drop on reported (malaria cases).

This year, the country only experienced 34 malaria cases as compared to the 648 that were dealt with last season.

National Malaria Programme Director Quinton Dlamini said Eswatini was one of the countries in the African region that are "ready to beat malaria" by 2020.

"The country is currently pursuing malaria elimination, where it hopes to have zero local malaria cases by 2020. Since the beginning of the 2018/2019 season, the country has recorded 34 local cases, a significant drop from last season's trend," Dlamini SADC MALARIA DAY TOMORROW

COMMEMORATION of Southern **African Development Community** (SADC) Malaria Day is recognised on November 6 every year and aims to create awareness about malaria as well as mobilise the community to participate in the malaria control programmes.

Communities are mobilised through health education to:

Recognise signs and symptoms

Dlamini said the country appears to be on top of the game in eliminating malaria when comparing it from the previous season.

However, these gains will be easily eroded if government was to renege on its responsibility and commitment, of malaria upon onset

- Seek treatment as soon as they recognise signs and symptoms
- Use personal protective measure at individual, household and community level
- Accept programmes interventions for malaria prevention

This year's commemoration will be held in Namibia tomorrow where

A total of 9 446 structures in 64 localities have been sprayed for the prevention of malaria this season.

However, the director said challenges were the frequent shortages of fuel and human resources to complete the remaining localities which are most likely to take Eswatini back to what the country experienced last year

Meanwhile, Dlamini urged members of the public to seek health care services within 24 hours of noting malaria symptoms such as headache fever, chills, nausea and diarrhoea

- Closing windows and doors early in the evenings

- Use of malaria prevention tablets when travelling to known malarias countries

He was advised to make a bail application at the High Court.

The attempted murder suspect was eventually remanded back into police custody by the magistrate as per the crown's application.

Dlamini is expected back in court on November 16, for trial.

The appointment of Dlamini comes after former national commissioner of police Isaac Magagula was made a Senator by His Majesty King Mswati III.


This was confirmed by Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati on Tuesday.

The two; Mhlelembisi Simelane and Philile Dlamini, are alleged to have embezzled the funds between the period of January 2016 to December 2017 while acting jointly and in a furtherance of a common purpose as they siphoned out of Magcineni Investments (Pty) Ltd a total sum of E135 091 for their personal use.

According to particulars of claim filed by the company (plaintiff), the defendants (Simelane and Dlamini) were the chairperson and treasure, respectively, and were responsible for making payments from the plaintiff's bank account.

The two allegedly acted unlawfully in that they did not have the authority to use the plaintiff's funds for their own personal use.

"The defendants were therefore unjustly enriching themselves with the sum of E135 091 and are liable to pay plaintiff the said sum. Despite demand, the defendants fail or refuse to pay plaintiff the sum of money or any sum at all, hence plaintiff claims the said sum from them jointly and severally the one

paying the other to be absolved at an interest of nine per cent per annum," reads the combined summons.

According to the warrant of execution issued by the High Court, the sheriff or his lawful deputy for Lubombo region or any other authorised person is hereby directed to attach of Mhlelembisi Simelane and adult male of Mangcineni area and Philile Dlamini, an adult female of the same area, and cause to be realised by public auction the sum of E135 091, together with interest at the rate of nine per cent per annum plus costs of suit.

... Two farmers file urgent application for stay of execution

IN a bid to prevent two cars from being sold though public auction after being attached, the two have since run to court seeking an order to have the sale in execution stayed.

Represented by lawyer Kwanele Magagula of Sithole, Magagula Attorneys, the two have taken the sugar cane farmer's company to court where they allege that the vehicles were wrongfully attached as one of the cars does not belong to Philile Dlamini while the other is still the property of an import car dealing company.

According to Simelane in his papers filed before court, they are also seeking that the order of the High Court issued against them be set aside and rescinded and further directing and ordering two Deputy Sheriffs Samkelo Ngwenya and Felix Vilakati to release the motor vehicles allegedly unlawfully attached. Unlawful

Meanwhile, in respect of Philile, they are seeking an order declaring the attachment of a vehicle belonging to Milton Dlamini (her husband) unlawful and directing same to be released to its owner.

The cars; a Hyundai Tucson 2007 model in respect of Simelane, who alleged that it is still the property of the Matsapha based car dealer Motor Centre as it is still being paid for, while the other car is a Mazda Axcella belonging to Milton Dlamini not Philile.

According to Simelane, they received summons in respect of the accusations that they embezzled funds and thereafter approached lawyer Zonke Magagula in a quest to have the matter solved amicably and Magagula stressed that there was a need for him to engage the two with the rest of the board members.

However, Simelane said he received a call from a friend of his who advised that he had seen a court roll in the newspapers and that his name was amongst defendants and he then instructed Magagula to defend the action.

He submitted that there was an error in granting of the default judgment as they had already filed a notice of intention to defend.

"YOU touch a woman, you touch a rock."

This is a direct translation of a Zulu saying; "Wathinta abafazi, wathinta imbokodo". Emaswati are also familiar with the saying as it is commonly used by both nationals.

The saying could also be used to explain what one Zondwako Mamba (57) experienced when he attempted to assault his wife, Thandi Maziya in front of her friends while at a drinking spot.

Mamba was thoroughly beaten up by the two women as they retaliated to his unbecoming act.

The two women were eventually arrested and charged with assault after the man sustained injuries. Christina Mamba (46) was the second accused person in the matter which was brought before the Eswatini National Court.

According to the charge sheet, the accused persons did wrongfully and unlawfully assault Mamba by hitting him with sticks several times on the head and body.

Realising

When the charge sheet was read to the accused persons, each of them pleaded guilty. When presenting his evidence, Mamba said he went to the drinking spot to fetch his wife after realising that it was getting late in the evening.

He said an argument ensued between them as his wife was not ready to go home. Mamba said he attempted to drag his wife home, something which resulted to him being attacked and assaulted by the two women. He alleged that he was beaten up until he was rescued by other patrons at the drinking spot.

During cross-examination, the second accused person said she was only assisting her friend after noting that she was being assaulted by her husband. Both accused persons admitted to have used sticks to hit the complainant. They were accordingly found guilty by the court. The court highlighted that the accused persons were lucky to have not been charged with the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act. Each of them was sentenced to four months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E400 fine.

Businessman's assault case truck off from court roll

SITEKI businessman Mfanufikile Mashaba's assault case has once again been struck off the court roll as the prosecution seemingly is uncertain on who should preside in the matter.

Mashaba, a public transport operator who owns a fleet of Quantums, was arrested in January and charged with common assault.

According to the charge sheet, he was alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully assaulted Musa Augustine Xaba by threatening to kill him.

Appearance

Xaba is a public transport vehicles examiner, and has become very popular amongst public transport operators. At the time of the alleged assault, Xaba was on official duty.

Mashaba made his first appearance in January before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula. The businessman told the court that he would be



pleading not guilty to the charge when trial finally commences.

However, for the past 10 months, the matter has been dragging before court without commencing trial. The delay in the commencement of trial has seen the matter being struck off the court roll two times already.

Mashaba is represented by lawyer Mzobanzi Dlamini. The matter was back in court last Friday, where the date of trial was to be set.

However, the Crown stated that the prosecution has received a directive that the matter be presided over by another judicial officer, other than the principal magistrate.

This is what was said to have delayed the commencement of trial. Prosecutor Zanele Mabila filed an application to have the matter removed from the roll. The application was not objected by defence counsel.

Recalling

Worth recalling from a previous appearance before the same court is that Mashaba told the court that the complainant fabricated a statement against him as a way to frustrate him in his business.

At one instance, Mashaba asked the court to issue an order stopping the complainant from examining any of his public transport vehicles, saying he always found fault where there was none. His application was unsuccessful though.


cally complete as it is now open to motorists.

The contract sum was E 2 773 472.94 and the work on the road started in early June 2018," he said. "As we speak, the contractor is completing



CHARGES WITHDRAWN AGAINST MIKE MAMBA

CHARGES against businessman Michael Mamba in the alleged Contravention of the Theft of Motor Vehicle Act have been withdrawn by the High Court.

The order was issued by the High Court following an application that was filed by the Director of Public Prosecutions (DP^D) to the effect that the charges be witnerawn.

The Crown was represented by Principal Crown counsel Macebo Nxumalo in the matter that was before Justice Ticheme Dlamini.

Mamba had been slapped with three charges which are theft of a motor vehicle, unering a forged document and contravening Section 42 (1) read with Section 2(b) (1) of the Prevention of Corruption Act 3 of 2006.

According to the Crown's indictment it alleged that the truck valued at E600 000 was stolen in South Africa, Durban in the lawful possession of Shawn Murugan.

The matter was initially before High

...High Court Judge Ticheme Dlamini issued an order that truck theft charges are forthwith withdrawn following an application filed by the Crown

Court Principal Judge Stanley Maphalala before it was dealt with by Judge Dlamini and Mamba had pleaded not guilty to all the charges against him.

The director of public prosecutions had failed to locate the South African truck that was released to the person who claimed ownership.

Through his lawyer Sabelo Bhembe of Bhembe Attorneys, he had applied for its return in order to question the witnesses afresh as the trial was before another Judge.

Mamba had initially instructed lawyer Martin Dlamini to represent him at trial and he pleaded not guilty to all the charges.

The trial commenced and the claimant of the truck was called to come to his vehicle (evidence) where an inspection in loco was conducted at the Lobamba Police Station.

After that the claimant applied to have the truck released to him and the court

granted him his wish.

Mamba instructed lawyer Bhembe and the latter applied to be given the record of proceedings to acclimatise himself with the matter.

That could not be done as the record was incomplete. Bhembe also filed an application to have the truck returned and the witness recalled.

The crown, opposed the application, but the court overruled it on the grounds that it was Mamba's right.

Judge Maphalala had stated that the parties' lawyers ended up agreeing that the matter should be started afresh and it was postponed to another date.

However, on the return date Mamba argued that the matter could not start afresh in the absence of an exhibit in court

Following Judge Maphalala's appointment to the Supreme Court bench, the matter was then allocated to Judge Dlamini.

Cash for jobs cases complex to crack - Cops

WHEN thugs break into a shop such criminal activity is pretty-easy for police to resolve.

However, when people collude in cash-for-jobs, it takes much more collaboration with parties involved, more skill, and time for the police to resolve.

That notwithstanding, the Royal Eswatini Police Service continues to crack a number of such cases by investigating which leads to arrest, prosecution and successful conviction of suspects.

According to Police Chief Information and Communication Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati, such cases are difficult to crack because both parties work together in the commission of the crime, which makes them difficult to investigate.

"It has been observed as well that most of these cash—for—jobs cases are driven by people's desperation which means that often, fundamental precautions are not taken by the people who end up being robbed of their hard earned money," explains Vilakati.

She further indicates that while some of the recent cash—for—jobs crimes have been committed through Mobile Money, it does not mean that the payment platform is a problem.

"What is actually a challenge is the collusion and non-reporting of such cases which is often accompanied by a bridge of normal processes which should make it easier to trace suspects, like cash outs without an ID, for instance," explains Vilakati.

MTN's Corporate Affairs Manager, Mandla Luphondvo, who was also engaged on this matter, agrees with Vilakati. "Preliminary findings on this challenge show that at least 49 people have been defrauded about E80 000 in the form of deposits made through Mobile Money to different numbers which are suspected to be part of the cash—for—jobs syndicate which uses the ministry of agriculture and other government parastatals as prospective places of employment," he explains.

While Mobile Money has made it convenient for both the banked and unbanked, to send and/or receive money from friends and loved ones, the payment platform is also being abused by conmen who now collect cash from unemployed citizens, who are made to believe they will be rewarded with jobs.

Prevention

To avoid these thriving criminal activities, Vilakati encourages all those who have lost their money to report such incidents to the nearest police station. Further, she says it is important for the public to know that the person paying for a job is committing a crime just like the one who is milking a desperate job seeker of his money.

As a precautionary measure Luphondvo encourages Mobile Money customers to exercise caution each time they are to transact on the platform.

"Besides the fact that the cash-for-jobs is illegal, it is rare that applicants are required to deposit money, in the region of thousands, before they are considered for employment. That should be the first point that triggers suspicion. Customers need to make sure that they pay for authentic good and services, which are legal," said Luphondvo. He further encouraged Mobile Money customers to avoid the use of remote deposits where you call a person to collude with a Mobile Money vendor to deposit money into your wallet in your absence. "The use of personal identification documents and verification of customers transacting on Mobile Money is a regulatory requirement that additionally protects those transacting on the platform," he concluded.

YELLOW FEVER OUTBREAK...

Don't panic, health ministry warns Emaswati

FOLLOWING the yellow fever outbreak in Ethiopia, the Director of Health Services Dr Vusi Magagula calls for the country not to panic.

"Yes. there is a yellow fever outbreak but Ema; wati should not panic, the country is not yet in danger," Magagula said on Tuesday during an interview.

Magagula shared that the World Health Organisation (WHO) has 1.45 million doses of yellow fever vaccine from its emergency stockpile after the deadly mosquito-borne disease killed 10 people in southwestern Ethiopia

The outbreak, the director said, was confirmed in Wolaita Zone of the Southern nations, nationalities, and peoples' region and has been traced back to a patient who fell ill on August 21. It has caused 35 suspected cases of the disease and has taken lives of 10 civilians. Magagula stated that symptoms of the disease are almost similar to that of malaria which includes fever, headache, jaundice, muscle pain, nausea, vomit-

ing and fatigue. Magagula added that only a small proportion of patients who contract the virus develop severe symptoms and about half of those die within seven to 10 days.

Moreover, Magagula said Eswatini have vaccines for yellow fever which can be easily accessed from local hosnitals

He said the country has never lost lives due to yellow fever and that Eswatini has made vaccines available for the nation, especially those who are travelling to other countries.

The director explained that yellow fever vaccines are strong and a person is required to have a dose once in their lifetime, not twice.

He urged the nation to always visit the hospital for a yellow fever vaccine whenever they are travelling.

"Yellow fever is prevented by an

What is yellow fever?

Yellow fever is an acute viral.hemorrhagic disease transmitted by infected mosquitoes. The 'yellow' in the name refers to the jaundice that affects some patients. Symptoms of yellow fever include fever, headache, jaundice, muscle pain, nausea, vomiting and fatigue. A small proportion of patients who contract the virus develop severe symptoms and approximately half of those die within sevent to 10 days.

Large epidemics of yellow fever occur when infected people introduce the virus into heavily populated areas with high mosquito density and where most people have little or no immunity due to lack of vaccination.

A booster dose of the vaccine is not needed. The vaccine provides effective immunity within 10 days for 80 to 100 per cent of people vaccinated, and within 30 days for more than 99 per cent of people vaccinated.

extremely effective vaccine, which is safe and affordable.

A single dose of yellow fever vaccine is sufficient to confer sustained immunity and life-long protection against yellow fever disease," Magagula said.

Signs and symptoms

Once contracted, the yellow fever virus incubates in the body for three to six days. Many people do not experience symptoms, but when these do occur, the most common are fever, muscle pain with prominent backache, headache, loss of appetite, and nausea or vomiting. In most cases, symptoms disappear after three to four days.

A small per centage of patients, however, enter a second, more toxic phase within 24 hours of recovering from initial symptoms. High fever returns and several body systems are affected, usually the liver and the kidneys. In this phase people are likely to develop jaundice (yellowing of the skin and eye, hence the name 'yellow fever'), dark urine and abdominal pain with vomiting. Bleeding can occur from the mouth, nose, eyes or stomach. Half of the patients who enter the toxic phase die within seven - 10 days.

The director urged the nation to make sure that one never travels to other countries without getting the vaccine, especially to countries where the yellow fever virus is endemic, normally common in the tropical regions of Africa.

ANGRY STUDENTS STORM MITC, COPS CALLED IN

POLICE had to be called when livid Manzini Industrial Training Centre, (MITC), Siteki Industrial Training Centre (SITC), and Nhlangano Agricultural Skills Training Centre (NASTC) students stormed MITC premises in Manzini demanding to be allowed back to class or be refunded their money after the skills centres halted operations.

Skills centres around the country closed three months back, citing the lack of funds as the main reason for the closure. Students were sent home and told they would be informed when to return to class.

The over 500 trainees from the Swaziland Skills Centres (SSC) are now frustrated as they have still not been called back and are languishing at home. On Tuesday, a section of the students stormed the institutions offices in Manzini, demanding an audience with SCC Director Brian Magongo. However, upon seeing the angry students blocking the gate early in the morning, it is said the administration officers quickly left the place and called the police to calm the angry students.

The security guard manning the area locked out the students with the help of police officers.

Police then engaged the students and tried to get them to talk with the admin-

istration to no avail.

The students were informed that the superiors had since left the premises and efforts to get hold of them were futile as their phones were later switched off. The students made it clear that they will not back down until they are addressed on the issue.

They have given the administration a week to meet and come back with answers by Monday. The students said failure to do so would result in them taking drastic action, come Tuesday next week. They said the sad part is that they were forced to pay fees before they could even start lessons.

"But now that we have paid, we are being chucked out of the institutions," they said.

The students alleged that it seems there is a person whom they referred to as a 'fat rat' who is helping himself on the funds meant to run the skills centres ad this has resulted in the institutions failing to purchase learning materials, pay salaries for support staff, settle electricity bills and other ancillary expenses.

They said this has led to the closure of the skills centres. For the better part of Tuesday, police and students were involved in a stand-off at the institution's gate.

16-month baby boy found abandoned

POLICE are looking for the mother of a 16-month old baby boy who was found dumped at a makeshift structure near Ned-so outside Nhlangano.

The healthy looking baby boy was found by a passerby on Saturday morning. According to Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati, the baby was found neatly wrapped in blankets and well placed on a structure resembling a makeshift market. She said it was clear that someone placed the baby in the vicinity and ruled out the possibility that it (baby) was forgotten by its mother or anyone related to him. Others

in the community were of the view that since there is a bus stop close to where the baby was found, it could be that its mother forgot it as she boarded a bus or any other public transport.

"Hlatikulu police are appealing to the members of the public to assist in finding the baby's mother or relatives. The baby was found by a man who was just passing by and it was wrapped with blankets alive. We appeal to anyone who can assist us in tracing the parent/s to call the acting (Shiselweni) Regional Crime Branch Officer (RCBO) Superintendent Celani Mabuza at 7607 6431 or Hlatikulu Police Desk Officer Bheka Mabuza at 7614 2045. They (public) can also call 999 or any of the nearest police stations," said Supt. Vilakati.

Brief background of the matter

STUDENTS enrolled at the Swaziland Skills Centres were sent home in September after the institutions were closed as government and the directors failed to reach an agreement.

The bone of contention being that the SSC maintains that it is not accountable to the ministry but to the directors of the company while government, on the other hand, demands that the managers must ensure that the subvention is accounted for since management signs the cheques.

It is said in the past, government would simply release subventions to the institutions and did not keep track of the funds as the directors of SSC did not account for the funding save to train those that had enrolled. However, it has been reported that since this year, things took an unusual turn as government introduced a monitoring tool of accountability in the use of the funds.

This has been through planting centre managers who act as 'principals' to report to the ministry on the use of the public funds, among other responsibilities. They are to ensure that the funds are used accordingly and procurement procedures are adhered to. These are to be co-signatories with the director(s) and financial officer on the funds.

This seems to have been the root cause of the disagreement between government and SSC. This disagreement ended with the institutions failing to pay staff and buy material, among other things.

After fruitless meetings between government, SCC and students, the institutions ended up being closed indefinitely by the ministry of education and training through a letter from Principal Secretary Dr Sibongile Mtshali, dated September 13.

SCC gave us unsatisfactory answers - PS Mtshali

CONTACTED, Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Education and Training Dr Sibongile Mtshali, who authorised the closure of the institution, said there is no hope that the skills centre would be opened anytime soon.

She said this is because they have received unsatisfactory responses from the SCC in terms of accounting for funds given to them.

Mtshali said as a ministry, they have since engaged their legal advisors who are now handling the matter and they would advise the ministry on the next step to take.

She said it must be noted that SCC is a private company and it is hard for government to intervene without engaging the directors of the company. Mtshali said all they want is for the company to be accountable on who

signs for the funds that would be released by government and they have refused to do that, something which places the ministry in in an awkward position. She said if the company does not want to comply then, as government, they will not be able to release the funds.

The principal secretary said they have since learned that sponsors of the students paid for nothing as the learners are not attending classes as some are made to attend classes in the morning. Other students only attend classes in the afternoon.

"That is not how institutions of higher learning are run. We have to fix this," she said. She wondered how the students could be helped now in the event the centres could reopen since they have already lost a lot in terms of learning.


the same offence against his girl-friend.

LISWATI THROWN UNDER MOVING TRUCK, DIES IN SA

A local truck driver based in the Republic of South Africa died tragically after being thrown under a moving truck in the neighbouring country.

Zweli Gamedze (33) of Mpolonjeni in Siteki was an employee of Mangethe Transport, a truck company situated in the Gauteng Province in Katlehong. He reported for duty on October 28, on a Sunday afternoon and was headed for Delmas where he had to fetch bags of cement.

This was revealed by his colleague at Mangethe, who also happens to be his neighbour in Siteki. Speaking on condition of anonymity, he said his colleague had a reflector on the passenger's seat and while he was driving the truck, he was stopped by members of the Kombi association along Daveyton who inspect the ferrying of potential customers by the heavy vehicles. Apparently, they had mistaken the reflector for a passenger. After realising that Gamedze was alone in the truck, an argument erupted and bitter words were exchanged. The three Kombi association members who had stopped him allegedly pushed him as the argument gained momentum. An oncoming truck hit him and he fell to the ground. After the incident, the three are said to have took off in a vehicle they were travelling in, leaving Gamedze for dead.

"The truck driver who hit Gamedze quickly took the car registration of the offenders and he called the police who chased after them.

Two of them were apprehended and the other is still at large. Gamedze was then rushed to hospital by the police but he succumbed to death the following day due to severe injuries and internal bleeding," said the source.

His grandmother, Gogo Mkhonta said that the corpse is still in South Africa at Hillbrow mortuary and the family is still trying to arrange for his transportation into the country with financial constraints deferring them. His company allegedly gave the family only E7 000, which was the deceased's monthly salary yet the costs of ferrying the corpse are above that.

"We are still devastated by his passing and we have spoken to several people whom we hope will help us in repatriating his body back to the country for burial," she said.

Gamedze's parents passed away according to his grandmother and he had two

children at the time of his passing. Bigboy Magagula, one of the local truck drivers in SA, said that they are also doing amends to help the situation by contributing financially but they have not gathered enough thus far.

He said they are hopeful that the money will be enough to cover the cost before the week ends. Police Information and Communication Officer (PICO) Phindile Vilakati said that they have no link with South African police hence the matter had not yet reached their attention. However, she said that cases of this nature are on the rise and they will try to forge a working medium with the neighbouring country so that they are alerted on these cases.

Allegations of detained journalists wrong - ministry of foreign affairs

THE ministry of foreign affairs and international cooperation has, after investigations, found that allegations against the Charge d'Affaires of Oatar's Embassy over the detention of two local journalists, are incorrect.

The two journalists, from The Times of Swaziland, were at the embassy to interview Qatar's Acting Ambassador Yaqoub Al Mulla about an incident in which he allegedly pointed a firearm at a street vendor.

The ambassador allegedly agreed to the interview but then tried to force the newspaper's business editor Kwanele Dhladhla and investigative journalist Welcome Dlamini to sign a secrecy agreement on October 5.

The ministry of foreign affairs announced that it is investigating an incident involving the Charge d'Affaires of Qatar's Embassy in the Kingdom of Eswatini, and journalists from the newspaper.

According to reports from Qatar, the peninsular Arab country's Foreign Affairs ministry said on Tuesday, as part of this investigation, the Government of Qatar received a report from the ministry of foreign affairs and international cooperation of Eswatini stating: "We have investigated the allegations that the Charge d'Affaires detained journalists at the Embassy of Qatar and we found that these allegations are incorrect."

The statement said that the report concluded that "based on this evidence, it is clear that journalists dealt with the Charge d'Affaires in an unprofessional manner, and that the portrayal of events was exaggerated and the matter was described as detention."

It added that "While the report of the Government of the Kingdom of Eswatini confirms that journalists violated the rules of conduct and professionalism during their interview with the Charge d'Affaires, the Government of the State of Qatar will continue its examination of the incident to determine whether any of the rules and protocols of the State of Qatar related to handling the press have been violated."

The ministry confirmed that it takes the freedom of the press seriously, stressing that "if any violation is found, an appropriate action will be taken."

Eswatini forwards condolences to Indonesia

THE Kingdom of Eswatini has sent its heartfelt condolences to Indonesia following the killing of 189 passengers and crew on board the Indonesian Lion Air Flight 610 last month.

"I have it in my command by His Majesty King Mswati III of the Kingdom of Eswatini, Her Majesty the Queen, the Government and the people of Eswatini, as well as my own to express our grief in learning about the tragic loss of lives as a result of the air accident with 189 lives aboard," said the country's Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini in a statement.

The statement mentioned that the ministry of foreign affairs and international cooperation presents its compliments to the embassy of the Republic of Indonesia, resident in Pretoria. It fur-

ther stated that the ministry has the honour to request the Embassy to transmit the Eswatini's deepest condolences to the Indonesian President Joko Widodo, the government and the people of Indonesia on their loss. "It is our hope and prayer that the Almighty God will comfort the next of kin and friends of those who lost their lives, the government and the people of Indonesia during this dark hour of bereavement," PM said.

Flight 610 was a scheduled domestic passenger flight operated by the Indonesian Airline Lion Air from Soekarno–Hatta International Airport in Jakarta to Depati Amir Airport in Pangkal Pinang.

The wreckage from the Boeing 737 MAX 8 aircraft was found in the Java Sea, off the coast of Java. All 189 passengers and crew were killed in the accident. One of the flight recorders from the aircraft was retrieved by a diver on November 1.

Meanwhile, the ministry of foreign affairs said it avails itself of the opportunity to renew to the Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in Pretoria, the assurances of its highest consideration.

Rains, winds cause 5-hour power outage in Pigg's Peak

MONDAY'S heavy rains coupled with strong winds caused a five-hour power outage in the Pigg's Peak Central Business District (CBD).

The multiple stop-start electricity outages affected the whole Pigg's Peak shopping centre complex buildings as well as the building located behind the bus rank.

One of the electricians from the Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC), who preferred anonymity, said the reason why some building experienced the outage while others did not was because the electricity lines followed different routes through the small town

"Not all the business buildings in the town suffered the electricity outages; this is because the electricity lines in the CBD follow different routes.

The bad weather is the chief cause for the electricity outages, but we are working quickly to rectify these problems," he said.

The electrician added that the town does not usually suffer electricity outages, but bad weather is unpredictable.

"As you can see, we are working quickly to resolve the problem, also it is very dangerous for us technicians to touch electricity while it rains so it would be a good idea if we wait and work only when the bad wet weather conditions have subsided," he added.

No funds for fighting climate change in Eswatini

UNLIKE other countries, Eswatini does not have funds saved strictly for fighting the effects of climate change and ozone depletion.

The Ministry of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Principal Secretary Emmanuel Dlamini said the country is not capable of handling huge amounts of funds aimed a climate change effects.

In a interview, the PS said the chang-

ing climate impacts society and ecosystems in a broad variety of ways.

He said one of the most alarming climate change effects is the dents on a country's economy.

"Climate-related impacts are occurring across the country and over many sectors of our economy. Government must play a central role to tackle the climate change crisis," he said.

He said a country has to have an authentic absorbing capacity, good managerial system which is corruption free or have principles on how to deal with corruption for it to handle the donated large sum of funds. As a result, most large sum projects are handled by non-governmental organisations.

The PS said climate change can alter rainfall, influence crop yields, affect human health, cause changes to forests and other ecosystems, and even impact our energy supply.

"To avoid the worst effects of climate change, we need to dramatically reduce global carbon emissions. But we must also prepare for the significant and unavoidable consequences of carbon emissions such as increasing temperatures, shifting precipitation patterns and the increasing intensity and frequency of extreme weather events," he said.

The PS said Eswatini can work with local communities to help nature and prepare people for the many impacts of the changing climate especially the conservation of forestry.

He emphasised that forests are home to many of the country's most endangered wildlife.

They also protect the planet by absorbing carbon dioxide, a major source of pollution that causes climate change.

"Eswatini needs to work directly

with countries, especially developing ones, to protect forests and benefit the livelihoods of local communities," Dlamini said.

Moreover, Dlamini said the ministry will be hosting a dialogue soon for sectors that are relevant to climate change namely, ministry of agriculture, natural resources and energy and other sectors that dwell on soil and waste. "Recommendations will be shared on how Eswatini can do to protect herself from the effects of climate change and those recommendations will be presented to an upcoming international meeting in Poland," he said.

INDVUNA IN CHILD SEX SCAM

A traditional indvuna is at the centre of a clandestine sex scam involving various young girls at a certain rural area under the Manzini region.

The indvuna, who is of pensionable age and a beneficiary of elderly grants, is said to have, over the years, lured young girls to his shop situated in the area.

He is said to have given the children foodstuffs and money in exchange for sexual favours as he operates a small grocery shop.

According to a relative to a young

woman, Nokukhanya* (21), who is said to have been in a 'relationship' with the indvuna since she was in primary school, they were 'aware' that something was not right for several years and could not stop the relationship.

"She was in Grade Six when they started the relationship to the extent that the girl became wayward and later fell pregnant," said a close relative who did not want to be named.

The relative said she could not state who the father of the child was because they became aware of the child's behavioural issues, along with the fact that she had a long term 'relationship' with the indvuna.

"I don't know if she really had multiple partners, but she had to drop out of school while doing Form Two and has never returned after falling pregpart"

Another family member stated that the young woman was invited to live with a relative and allegedly started having sexual relations with the husband and thereafter fell pregnant.

The suspicions which have over the years been whispered are said to have come to the fore recently when the young woman, on seeing the elderly man's car approaching the small grocery store, rushed to meet him as they usually did. "When she got there, she was shocked to see the man's wife

there as well and stated that she had forgotten money to buy as she made a return home."

Unfortunately, the wife is said to have been suspicious of the young woman who had looked at her husband adoringly.

Also, the fact that she did not have any money irked the wife further who has over the years been worried about the operations at the shop as stock was bought but no profit forthcoming.

As the young woman was leaving, the wife followed her out of the shop much against her husband's warning to desist as she was angry.

The confrontation is alleged to have

escalated to violence with the wife beating up the young woman to a near pulp and warning her to stay away from her husband.

Another neighbour alleged that the affair between Nokukhanya and the elderly man became the talk of the area after another school going girl found out that the two were an item, whereas she thought she was his only offair.

"When Zandile* found out that Nokukhanya* was also having an affair with the elderly man after finding them fondling each other, she talked about it and this is what made the wife suspicious that day," said the neighbour. According to a community leader, they had, as of last week, heard and identified 11 girls who have been victims of the man's sexual abuse. However, this matter has not been reported to the police.

Indvuna censured from church

THE Africa Evangelical Church (AEC) situated in the area has called on the elderly man to take a backseat from church activities.

According to Pastor Zwane who leads the local branch, the church came to a decision to censure the elderly man after they received reports of the incident involving the elderly man and the young woman.

"We are not aware of the incidents you are talking about except for the one reported to us," said Zwane as he disassociated himself from reports of 11 children allegedly being victims

He said they did not take censure lightly as it was a corrective measure to ensure that those who perform duties within the church have characters beyond reproach.

He said they were shocked by their findings as they talked to all three people.

This is presumably after the wife and young woman had an altercation recently. The pastor could not be drawn into what the allegations were that informed the censure as he said the church was not punitive but corrective in its operations.

He stated that thorough investigations were done, and their decision was in line with their principles.

THEY TRIED TO REMOVE INDVUNA ILLEGALLY - GCOKOMA

MANZINI Regional Administrator Chief Gcokoma says his office was not aware of issues happening in the area as they have not been procedurally reported.

The RA was approached after residents stated that they have over the years complained about the indvuna.

"We are aware that the indvuna is wanted out of his position," Chief Gcokomasaid.

This, he said, has been voiced out by the people who failed to use existing structures. "The chief is there and is the only one who can remove the indvuna.

If the royal household overseeing the area feels he is incapable of making such decisions, they are the ones who should make the call.

Not random people."

The Chief said in as much as the church acted within the ambits of their constitution, there were ways of getting things done traditionally as well so as to ensure transparency.

ALLEGATIONS STEM FROM JEALOUSY - INDVUNA

THE indvuna accused of abusing young girls for years has alleged that he was being accused by people who want his position.

The elderly man said he was not happy with the accusations made against him over the years as they stem from the same person, one against his position.

"I was once accused of calling people to weed the *umphakatsi*'s fields during Incwala and the media had a field day whereas this was a lie," said the indvuna. He said the current accusations were in the same spirit. "You want to make me a celebrity, go ahead."

He accused his wife of being weak-willed as she listened to her friends, something that was spoiling their relationship. He confirmed the incident which saw his wife beating up the young woman but denied that he had a relationship with Nokukhanya.

He said after the incident, he approached the man the young woman lives with and apologised.

He further stated that he was not censured from church as he was not aware of this.

"I was in church on Sunday and nothing happened. So I am not aware of what you are talking about as I will be attending services tonight without any problem," he said yesterday morning. Further, he said accusations that he gave children food items without them paying were wrong as he always told them to ask from his wife who also spends time managing the shop. He confirmed that his wife has over the years been complaining about lack of profits at the shop and he stated that this was not his doing.

`Indvuna targeted vulnerable children'

MOST of the children who have been alleged victims of the indvuna's predatory ways are said to be vulnerable as they are mostly orphaned.

This is according to a caregiver who said they would ask children who exhibited signs of abuse to talk about their issues.

She said they were shocked by their revelations as they talked about things that children should never bear witness to.

The young woman who has over the years been allegedly abused by the indvuna is said to be poor and would have all her basics bought by the man.

Another child, while revealing some of the details of alleged abuse by the indvuna, is said to have talked of detailed sexual actions whereas she is 11 years old. "She talked about how the man would perform oral

sex on her," said a community member.

Adding, he alleged that the shop which has a secluded area behind shelves has been used over the years with residents fearing that the indvuna would evict them from the area if they raise it through questions.



MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE (MR)

The Principal Secretary in the Prime Minister's Office, Mr Victor Nxumalo on the 1st of November, officiated at the launch of the 2018 World AIDS Campaign / World AIDS Day (WAC/WAD).

The launch attended by over 70 people from various sectors involved in the country's HIV and AIDS response was held at the Eswatini Water Services Corporation (EWSC), and hosted in partnership with the private sector, through the Swaziland Business Coalition on HIV/AIDS (SWABCHA).

"The annual World AIDS Campaign offer an opportunity for Eswatini to join the global community in reflecting and re-affirming our commitment to work together to overcome the HIV/AIDS epidemic, in line with His Majesty King Mswati III's vision of ending AIDS by 2022 – eight years earlier than the global target of 2030" stated Nxumalo in his keynote address.

The Principal Secretary (whom earlier, NERCHA director Khanyakwezwe Mabuza, had noted could not be referred to as 'Guest Speaker' owing to that the Prime Minister's office is the line ministry responsible for the HIV/AIDS response) further stated that the WAC/WAD 2018 theme, 'Know your status: let's end AIDS together,' will serve three main purposes.

He stated that the 2018 WAC/WAD campaign will serve to revitalise the benefits of knowing one's HIV status; impress on the importance of accessing the relevant services, inline with the HIV test outcome; and will mobilise everyone to overcome all FEAR to take an HIV test and know one's status, to sustain what the country has achieved in the HIV/AIDS response over the years, to contribute to and intensify efforts to end AIDS as a public health threat.

WORLD AIDS DAY 30TH ANNIVERSARY

This year marks the 30th anniversary on 1 December, of World AIDS Day which was first held as a one-day event, in 1988.

The 2018 theme seeks to mobilise everyone to test and know their HIV

Country set to mobilise all to overcome fear of testing for HIV

status

HIV testing is essential for expanding treatment and ensuring that all people living with HIV can lead healthy and productive lives.

It is also crucial in empowering people to make choices about HIV prevention, so they can protect themselves and their loved ones including achievement of the 95–95–95 targets by 2022.

Though significant progress has been made in HIV testing, since 84.7 per cent of people living with HIV know their status, there is the daunting task of getting the remaining 15.3 per cent to do same and further ensure they are also linked to the relevant quality care and prevention services - which has proved to be very difficult/ complex. Unfortunately, many barriers to HIV testing remain.

Stigma and discrimination still deter people from taking an HIV test. Access to confidential HIV testing is still an issue of concern. Many people still only get tested after becoming ill and symptomatic.

On a positive note, it is worth mentioning that there are now many new ways of expanding access to HIV testing.


These include: Self-testing, Community-based testing, and Multidisease testing, which enable people to test and know their HIV status.

Therefore, the 2018 WAC/WAD in addition to focussing on revitalising the benefits of knowing one's HIV status, and the importance of accessing the relevant services thereafter, it will also advocate for the expansion of services to reach the 'left behind' population groups, as well as call for the removal of all barriers to accessing HIV testing, including stigma and discrimination.

All these will hopefully mobilise the nation to 'End AIDS Together' as a public threat by 2022.

Speaking at the launch event, UNAIDS Country Director, Tim Rwabuhemba emphasised that knowledge of HIV status was still very low, siting that global statistics showed that 9.4 million people living with HIV worldwide do not know their HIV status - meaning HIV testing remained an important element of global advocacy.

He said HIV testing is important for the expansion of treatment services, as well as important for its prevention aspect as it empowers people to make choices on how they can protect themselves from infection, re-infection, and protect their loved



ones from infection.

He noted that the larger populace of the Kingdom of Eswatini is HIV negative, making it even more imperative for individuals to know their status, to prevent new HIV infections.

The UNAIDS Country Director said there is need to expand HIV testing programmes, for which the country needs demonstrated political will, smart investment, as well as novel and innovative approaches to HIV testing that are fully leveraged and taken to scale.

2018 WAC/WAD ACTIVITIES

As the World AIDS Campaign has become a social movement (one in which individuals, groups of people, communities, organisations, the public and private sectors participate; and the leadership at all levels, have taken ownership and actively participate in the campaign) the 2018 WAC/WAD will present an opportunity for the different stakeholders to engage with the theme. Some of the key activities will include:

Partnerships - Creating partnerships to reach targeted populations e.g., men during soccer matches, young people, prisoners, and injectable drug users (hidden population) etc.;

Exhibitions (candle lighting and information stalls) - For education and information sharing on HIV testing; the benefits of knowing HIV status vs the disadvantages of not knowing; follow up services available; and promotion of regular testing.

This can be a standalone activity or

can be held together with other activities, i.e. Exhibitions at the workplace, during soccer games;

Marches - To advocate for specific issues – like the provision of self-test kits to prisoners;

Dialogues - Interactive sessions with the target population (at community level, workplace etc.). The Enjobeni Majaha programme designed and delivered by the SiphilaNje Drama Society will be taken to 4 communities around Big Bend, in the weeks preceding the national commemoration. Also, Super Buddies and Save the Children have on-going dialogues with parents from the Nkilongo Inkhundla on adolescent sexual and reproductive health (ASRH).

Mass Media campaign - To promote HIV testing (e.g. use of jingles on radio)

Widespread provision of HIV testing and other related services
- To be provided as standalone or in conjunction with other services (the workplace).

Speeches and presentations - Information dissemination and advocacy in informal settings.

The regional activities kick-off on Saturday 17 November, with the Hhohho Region Commemoration to be held at Madlangempisi Inkhundla, held in partnership with HC4.

This will be followed by the Manzini Regional Commemoration to be held at the Mavuso Trade Centreon Friday 23rdNovember, in partnership with The AIDS Healthcare Foundation (AHF) Eswatini.

The Shiselweni region will have their commemoration at Maseyisini Inkhundla, on Saturday 24th November, and will target out-of-school youth.

The Right Honourable Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Eswatini, His Excellency Mr. Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini will officiate at the National World AIDS Day Commemoration to be held on Saturday, 1 December at Mayaluka Stadium in the Lubombo Region.

Of note, the national event will be held in partnership with the private sector, in conjunction with SWABCHA. Business that is already on board, includes the Ubombo Sugar (who boldly stated that people are their biggest resource) and the Eswatini Water and Agriculture Development Enterprise (EWADE)—Lower Usuthu Irrigation Project 2 (LUSIP II).

The Royal Swaziland Sugar Corporation, Crookes Plantation, MTN Eswatini, and many others have indicated an intention not only to have activities for their staff, but a willingness to support other activities that are a part of the year-long recently launched campaign.

MEN AND YOUNG PEOPLE THE TARGET

Studies have shown that one of the key factors for not taking an HIV test, is fear. Many people fear the outcome of the result.

This is a personal, deep seated dread that one needs to overcome to undertake an HIV test. Fear such as: What will happen if I test HIV positive? How will I live with HIV? Do I need to disclose my status and to whom? How do I disclose my HIV-positive status?

The resolve for the 2018 WAC/WADis to promote collective participation and contribution to the call to end AIDS by 2022.

The aim is to increase the number of men, boys and young people (identified as part of the hard to reach) who know their HIV status and understand the benefits of knowing their HIV status.

Speaking at the 2018 WAC/WAD launch, NERCHA Director, Khanyakwezwe Mabuza mentioned that though the country's HIV response had come far, the almost 7 000 annual new infections are still high.

The country has therefore set ambitious targets of reducing new infections by 85 per cent (almost 6 000); halve HIV deaths; and have 95 per cent of those living with HIV knowing their status by 2022

Let no one be left behind. Act now. Know your HIV status.

ON THIS DAY

...NOVEMBER 8

1793 - The Louvre Museum, in Paris, opened to the public for the first time.





Focus our prayers on God's increasing kingdom instead of the world's crumbling system.


Apart from Christ, this world will continue to fall apart. We shouldn't be surprised at the failure of man's attempt to secure peace and free-

ELECTORAL fraud, election manipulation, or vote rigging is defined as the illegal interference with the process of an election, either by increasing the vote share of the favoured candidate, depressing the vote share of the rival candidates, or both.

What constitutes electoral fraud varies from country to country. In a narrow election, a small amount of fraud may be enough to change the result.

Even if the outcome is not affected, the revelation of fraud can have a damaging effect, if not punished, as it can reduce voters' confidence in democracy.

While many voters may be aware of corruption during elections, they usually choose to turn a blind eye towards it and still vote for that person they know has used unconventional means to get into office.

The reaction of voters to corruption in public office is complex and there are several reasons why voters could choose to re-elect a corrupt politician; voters may not be well informed about the incumbent's behaviour and may not hold her responsible, voters may be willing to endure a corrupt public official in exchange for short periods of food parcels and benefits that come with the individual's campaign strategies, voters may see corruption as a personal flaw, when corruption is used to benefit certain ethnic or social groups, voters from these groups might reward corrupt politicians and help him avoid a general loss of votes.

According to a 2017 survey study, the following factors have been attributed as causes of Time and again, corruption: Greed of money, power, luxury or any other materialistic desires. Higher levels of market and political monopolisation.

Low levels of democracy, weak civil participation and low political transparency. In spite of the existence of an Anti-

Corruption Commission (ACC) in the Kingdom of Eswatini, corruption persists as a major problem in the country which brings with it significant negative consequences on the economy and society.

Among its major consequences, it hinders service delivery, leads to increased and more serious crimes and vandalism, results in moral degeneration, affects the collection of gov- the voters' roll had been extended

ernment revenue, results in a few individuals enjoying economic benefits, hinders the effectiveness of the administration of justice, results in the poor getting poorer and the rich getting richer, and damages the country's reputation and investment potential.

On 20 September 2017, the Swazi Observer reported the inspection of because of doubts that they were accurate.

These complaints and reports continued even on the day of the elections this year, national newspapers reported.

South Africa investigates sterilising mosquitoes in anti-malaria drive

SOUTH Africa is one of four southern African countries aiming to eliminate malaria transmission by

Indoor residual spraying using DDT and pyrethroid insecticides constitutes the backbone of South Africa's malaria control programmes.

Effective vector control by indoor residual spraying has been key in the reduction of malaria cases.

This was instrumental in creating malaria-free zones in most parts of the country.

Malaria transmission is now limited to the north-eastern parts of Limpopo province, the low-veld areas of Mpumalanga province and the far northern parts of KwaZulu-Natal province.

Despite a concerted effort to eliminate malaria in these provinces, transmission has remained steady over the past decade.

Failure to eliminate malaria transmission is attributed, in part, to resistance to the insecticides being used. Added to this is the challenge of controlling the outdoor-biting Anopheles arabiensis population that's largely considered responsible for most malaria transmission in the country.

Indoor spraying isn't completely effective against this mosquito because it mainly targets indoor biting and resting mosquitoes.

This strategy is not adequate against vectors that sometimes feed and rest

outdoors, such as An. arabiensis.

Other, complementary vector control strategies are needed to eliminate the disease. These must be able to control outdoor feeding and resting mosquito populations.

One possible approach is a technique that involves sterilising the insects. The technology is currently being assessed in South Africa.

The technique involves a genetic birth control method in which laboratory mass-produced sterile male insects are released into the wild at a ratio that effectively inundates a target population.

This forces most females to mate with sterile males, substantially reducing their fecundity, and resulting in population suppression.

The sterile insect technique has been piloted against mosquito vectors of the Zika, yellow fever, chikungunya and dengue viruses, but has never been used for malaria control efforts.

The South African sterile insect technique initiative together with a similar trial in Sudan are a first for African malaria vectors

Preparations for the South African project are at an advanced stage. A pilot mass-rearing facility has been built and the size of the natural mosquito population has been estimated.

In addition, a local community has been drawn into preparations and is now ready for a trial run.

All these steps pave the way for a pilot demonstration.

THE PROJECT

The sterile insect technique has been applied successfully against other insect pests including the fruit fly and the new-world screwworm fly.

In South Africa this technology is routinely used in Citrusdal, Western Cape to control the false codling

The project involving An. arabiensis aims to show that the sterile insect technique can be successfully used to suppress mosquito populations that carry and spread malaria. If it works, the approach can be used as an alternative vector control method to complement existing strate-

The project is being implemented in three phases.

Phase One included trials showed that sterilised, an arabiensis males mass-reared under laboratory conditions can compete with fertile males

This milestone informed phase II of the project which is currently under-

This phase aims to test the feasibility of the sterile insect technique through a small-scale pilot field demonstration in northern KwaZulu-Natal. Research activities for phase II are in progress.

The biggest development here is the building of Africa's first pilot

mosquito mass-rearing facility.

The sterile insect technique relies heavily on inundating the wild population with sterilised male insects. For this to succeed, it's important to know the size of the wild mosquito population as this will determine how many laboratory-reared sterilised males would need to be released.

NEXT STEPS

The eventual rollout of the pilot trial will require successful mass rearing of competitive sterile males and a technique to separate males from female insects.

Work on optimising mass production of quality sterile male and a system to separate males from females are at an advanced stage.

In addition, it's critical to get the community involved and addressing any social issues so that people cooperate and participate.

This is particularly important because the sterile insect technique can be seen as increasing the numbers of mosquitoes in an area after the release of the sterile males.

A malaria awareness campaign has already been conducted. Information on malaria transmission and control including the potential of using the sterile insect technique - was shared through radio interviews, brochures, road shows and lectures in isiZulu.

Inaugural AfDB African Investment Forum:

INVESTMENT NOTALL WILL TRANSFORM AFRICA'

...Continent's top DFI presidents bet Africa has what it takes to become economic powerhouse

PRESIDENTS of the continent's top development finance corporations yesterday unanimously agreed that only investment can transform Africa, not aid.

Such profound sentiments were expressed during the official opening of the first-ever African Investment Forum (AIF) held at the Sandton Convention Centre in South Afirca. The AIF is championed by the African Development Bank (AfDB), and is living up to the expectation of being Africa's premier market-place as hundreds of investors from within the continent and outside jurisdictions yesterday converged to strictly pen deals across different sectors including energy, agriculture, heavy industry, ICTs, telecommunications and other sectors.

Speaking during the AIF's curtain-raising panel discussions, DFI bosses who affirmed against the aid mentality were Dr. Akinwumi Adesina, who is President of the African Development Bank (AfDB), Patrick Dlamini, CEO of the Development Bank of Southern Africa (DBSA), Professor Benedict Oramah, President of the Africa Import-Export Bank, Dr. Bandar Hajjar, President of the Islamic Development Bank, Alain Ebosise, CEO of Africa 50, Mallam Zubairu, CEO of the Africa Finance Corporation and Ambroise Fayolle, Vice President of the European Investment Bank.

These panellists were joined by Gauteng Premier David Makhura. In his opening remarks, the AfDB president pronounced Africa's great potential to turn its economic fortunes.

"Our continent can be number one. "When I was growing up, my father used to ask how the exams were at school and also inquired on the grades we received. When I received position seven or 10, he would ask: 'The person who got number one, didn't he have two hands," Adesina said, adding that the continent should bank in its self-belief and domestic resources to turn its economic tide. The AIF's main focus is on facilitating transactons between project funders, investors. It also seeks to turn ideas into bankable projects while also de-risking projects and fasttracking deals that were in the pipeline. The AfDB

president noted that in the past, investors were left off with the feeling that investing in Africa was like landing in a bumpy strip. "We want to ensure a smooth landing strip for all investors," he said. Speaking in the same opening session, president of the Africa Import/Export Bank called for the continent's rebranding.

Disasters

"In the past, Africa was well-known as the place where all kinds of disasters struck, a place of wars and crises. But today, we are telling the world that our continent is an investment destination," he said. President of the Trade and Development Bank, in another matter, spoke of how the AIF had managed to attract a strong group of development financial institutions to come together to discuss ways in which to co-operate.

He also observed that while the continent already has, to some extent, decent levels of investment, these are just not enough to bring the required transformation. "Even if we are doing a lot, but this still is not enough to transform. We obviously need to change our business models, and this especially goes for the DFIs," he said.

Africa least recipient of private sector investment

These figures were divulged yesterday by the CEO of Africa 50 Alain Ebosise at the official opening of the Africa Investment Forum at Sandton Convention Centre.

"We need to bridge the investment gap in Africa and no one government or financial institution has the amount of money needed to transform the continent. However, if we work together, we may not reach Latin America's \$45 billion in one year but we can certainly make significant strides," he said.

ESCCOM GRANTS MTN 10-YR LICENCE RENEWAL TILL 2028

AFTER several months of evaluation, Eswatini Communications Commission (ESCCOM) has finally approved the renewal of telecommunications ojant, MTN Eswatini's operating licence, for an additional 10 years effective November 16, 2018. This comes at a time when MTN is celebrating 20 years of existence in the Kingdom of Eswatini. The company was initially licensed in November 18, 1998 to provide mobile telephony networks and services in the Kingdom of Eswatini. In November 2016, ESCCOM converted MTN licences to align with new legal and regulatory regime. Therefore, the commission issued an Electronic Communication Service License (ECS License) and an Electronic Communications Network License (ECN License)

Jointly, these licenses allowed MTN to own and operate electronic communications networks and services in the Kingdom of Eswatini on a converged and technology neutral basis. Both licenses were set to expire on November 17 this year.

The renewal of MTN's licences has been officially announced by ESCCOM Chief Executive Mvilawemphi Dlamini through General Notice No.12 of 2018, in accordance with Electronic Communications Act No.9 of 2013.

MTN applied for the renewal of both licences on August 4, 2017. After the company's application for the renewal of its ECS and ECN licences, the regulator embarked on the licence renewal process which included an evaluation of MTN's compliance with the prevailing legislation, licence conditions, regulations, decisions, guidelines, determinations and authorisations issued by the commission to assess; whether the licences should be renewed, if so, on what terms they should be renewed, and whether any sanctions should be issued in the event of non-compliance.

ESCCOM noted that MTN duly submitted all the required information to help the commission come up with a proper decision.

"The evaluation process undertaken by the commission found that Swazi MTN has complied broadly with the obligations as set out in the previous and current licences, legislative and regulatory instruments," said the regulator.

In its findings, the regulator said all services provided by MTN were provided in a manner that was compliant with the scope of the licence, all legislative instruments, regulations, decisions, guidelines, determinations and authorisations issued by the commission. The findings also show that all tariffs and charges for electronic communications services offered by MTN were approved by the

THE ECN LICENCE:

It allows Eswatini MTN to establish, operate and maintain an electronic communications network; interconnect its network with and lease facilities from any duly licenced Electronic Communications Network licensee within the Kingdom of Eswatini, and to provide Electronic Communications Network services and lease facilities to any duly licensed operator providing Electronic Communications Services and Broadcasting Services within the Kingdom of Eswatini.

The terms and conditions of the licence will be in accordance with the prevailing licensing framework, as may be amended from time to time. However, the regulator said additional new terms and conditions shall be included in the new licences to address any non-compliance issues identified during the evaluation process.

The new licenses will be issued by to MTN upon payment of the licence fees levied in terms of section 14 of the Electronic Communication (Licencing Regulations, 2016, for the evaluation and renewal of the license.



OVER E8.4 TRILLION NEEDED TO NANCE AFRICA'S SDGS YEARLY

IN its latest publication, ESEPARC identifies the importance of reliable, accurate and impartial research and an evidence based approach to policymaking and implementation as being crucial towards the attainment of the Sustainable Development Goals

ESEPARC is the Eswatini Economic Policy Analysis and Research Centre.

The African Development Bank (AfDB) estimates the continent could require an estimated E8.4 trillion to finance SDGs each year.

The continent's infrastructure alone needs require an estimated \$600 billion yearly, with an existing financing gap of \$68 billion.

Not even the AfDB, with its substantial contribution towards the continent's development needs comes close at closing this gap.

It is against this backdrop, coupled with other existing challenges and opportunities in Africa's investment space that the AfDB championed the AIF, a multistakeholder, multi-discilipinary platform dedicated to advancing projects to bankable stages, raising capital and

accelerating the financial closure of deals. AfDB describes the AIF as Africa's premier investment market place, through which the AfDB, along with itspartners will structure deals, screen and enhance projects, attract coinvestors and facilitate transactions to close the continent's investment gaps.

It is expected that this market-place will reduce intermediation costs, improve the quality of project information and documentation, an increase active and productive engagements between African engagements and the private sector. The AIF comes at a time when African businesses are notably erupting in number and sophistication. This, according to the AfDB, presents excellent investment opportunities with relatively high returns.

Women pioneers promote woman economic participation

IN creating a more balanced workspace, women pioneer is hosting women leaders today at Sibane hotel on the importance of having women participating in economic activities.

Speaking in an interview founder of Women pioneer Kholwaphi Dlamini Mdziniso said the half day conference is scheduled for 14:00, where prominent women leaders in the country will be sharing their secret in leadership success. The Women Pioneers platform according to Dlamini Mdziniso is aimed at recognising women that have defied the odds to occupy seats in places that were solely occupied by men. The platform is also a vehicle for motivating a girl to dream without limitations, to dream of anything she could aspire to be without reservations knowing that there are women who broke the odds to be first in places predominantly occupied by men.

"The Women Pioneer is a platform that is aimed at motivating girls and women to know that there have been women that have broken the odds to be trail blazers in places predominantly occupied by men. The goal for the platform is to create a culture of continued recognition of women, so that women continue to amass courage to feature and break forth in all economic areas," she said.

Dlamini Mdziniso said the project is aimed at recognising individuals as well as organisations that support women mainstreaming in meaningful positions and in key decision making positions. Recognising such organisations according to Mdziniso will motivate institutions to consider gender mainstreaming in areas that are still predominantly occupied by men, especially the key decision making positions. In addition Dlamini Mdziniso said women continue to face discrimination in access to work, economic assets and participation in private and public decision-making. Women are also more likely to live in poverty than men.

Dlamini Mdziniso also said in Latin America and the Caribbean, the ratio of women to men in poor households increased from 108 women for every 100 men in 1997 to 117 women for every 100 men in 2012, despite declining poverty rates for the whole region.

"Women remain at a disadvantage in the labour market. Globally, about three quarters of workingage men participate in the labour force, compared to only half of working-age women. Women earn 24 per cent less than men globally. In 85 per cent of the 92 countries with data on unemployment rates by level of education for the years 2012-2013, women with advanced education have higher rates of unemployment than men with similar levels of education. Despite continuous progress, today the world still has far to go towards equal gender representation in private and public decision-making," she said.

Telkom users to access Vodacom's 4G network

JOHANNESBURG - Telkom customers will soon be roaming on Vodacom's network, not on mobile multinational telecommunications group MTN's after Telkom entered a deal with Vodacom worth billions of rand.

The migration will begin in December, with full switchover planned by mid-2019. Telkom users will now have access to Vodacom's 4G network, as previously, with MTN, the deal was restricted to slower 2G and 3G speeds.

The agreement will also see Telkom having access to build infrastructure on Vodacom towers.

Telkom spokesperson Noma Faku told TechCentral that the agreement with Vodacom included seamless handover, meaning a call will not drop if it is passed by a Telkom tower to a Vodacom tower.

Faku said, "There will be no geographic restrictions as there are in the deal between Cell C and MTN. This means that even if a Telkom subscriber is in Johannesburg, and has Telkom signal, they can still choose to roam onto Vodacom's network if they prefer."

Vodacom Group CEO, Shameel Joosub, said: "We are extremely pleased that Telkom has selected Vodacom as its strategic partner and we look forward to delivering on this long-term and mutually beneficial agreement. By switching its roaming agreement to Vodacom, Telkom will have access to 9 auth Africa's best network with the



country's widest population coverage, a testament to our accelerated rural coverage programme and our commitment to ensuring the sustainability of South Africa's highly competitive telecommunications industry.

"Apart from the commercial benefit, this partnership between the country's fastest growing networks will also result in reduced network deployment costs for Telkom and cost savings for Vodacom, ultimately contributing to the reduction of data prices in South Africa."

CEO of Telkom, Sipho Maseko said: "Seamless handover and 4G mobile technology are new additions to Telkom's roaming agreement which will improve the customer experience on the Telkom network. The infrastructure sharing agreement will allow Telkom more efficient capital and operational expenditure." "It complements Telkom's network rollout programme as Telkom

remains committed to expanding its network. The agreement enables quicker site acquisition in the medium term. I am pleased we have concluded an agreement that enables us to improve our network efficiently." Earlier this year, Cell C announced that it had entered into a multibillion rand roaming agreement with MTN According to Cell C Chief Executive, Jose Dos Santos, said that although Cell C would carry majority of its data traffic on its own network, the long-term multibillion-rand agreement was significant.

"While Cell C still carries the vast majority of data traffic on its own network, as it has its own infrastructure in the metros, this deal is significant as it will provide 4G coverage to customers in outlying areas where we have chosen to buy rather than build coverage", said Dos Santos.

ONSLAUGHT OF CYBER-ATTACKS ON SA BUSINESSES - EXPERT

JOHANNESBURG - South African businesses of all sizes, including educational institutions, have been particularly hard hit by an onslaught of cyber-attacks, although this is not always public knowledge, according to Kerry Curtin, cyber risk expert at Aon South Africa.

Cyber risk was ranked as the number one risk facing educational institutions and is likely to remain so for the foreseeable future, according to

Aon's 2018 global risk management survey.

Curtin says the potential theft or leakage of data. particularly

confidential information in an educational setting, should be top of the list in risk planning.

"The need to strengthen institutional resiliency against potential damage, compromising hacks and downtime is crucial," she adds.

This is because schools, like any other business, are increasingly dependent on technology. The knockon effect of a cyber incident at an educational facility has the potential to be financially and reputationally

catastrophic.

For example, in 2016 it was reported that the University of Limpopo's website was taken down, leaking exam papers and the details of over 18 000 students, in addition to perpetrators publicly posting what was believed to be the login details for the University's intranet.

The sheer number of cyber-attacks on educational institutions suggests that the sector is not as prepared as it should be in its efforts to safeguard

networks, according to Curtin.

Aon provides the following tips for the education sector:

Safeguard institu-All computers, laptops and smart devices

owned by the educational institution should at the very least have a current anti-virus programme installed, in addition to adware and malware protection.

One of the biggest threats to any business is the people operating these devices and their naivety regarding cyber risks, so education is key.

BYOD Policy The practice of students and staff members bringing devices to school or university that interact with the

institution's network is very likely. The first line of defence is keeping guest devices separate from the network, allowing the institution to keep data secure on an administrative network, as well as monitor traffic more closely.

When it comes to sending sensitive information, it is crucial to implement a secure file exchange solution that can protect against cyber threats such as phishing scams.

Multi-Factor Authentication

While passwords alone do not provide adequate levels of security as hackers are able to circumvent physical biometrics such as fingerprint identification as a single layer of authentication, Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) is fast becoming the next line of defence.

Social Media Policy

Not only does the policy need to stipulate what is deemed as acceptable behaviour from employees and students, but it also needs to explain what the benefits are of becoming an ambassador for the brand and the legal ramifications inherent to social media platforms. News24

JOHANNESBURG - Climate change has fuelled raging wild fires

around the world, bleached coral reefs and intensified hurricanes - and now it's coming for those tasty fries.

A hot and dry summer has caused low potato yields in Belgium and across Europe, resulting in sad, stubby fries or 'frites'-up to an entire inch shorter than the threeinch norm.

The news gets worse: If the plan was to wash down those salty frites with a cold Belgian beer, then back to the drawing board. There might also

be a shortage of the brew due to an expected decrease in barley yields.

This problem is bigger than a hefty bar tab: Climate change is already reducing yields of wheat, rice, coffee and cocoa. Agriculture is dependent on weather patterns, and climate change is directly influencing them, resulting in droughts in already dry regions of the world and floods in regions that already receive enough rain.



EN MEN ARRESTED FOR BEING GAY' IN TANZA

TANZANIA - At least 10 men have been arrested on the Tanzanian island of Zanzibar for 'being gay' days after a high-profile politician created a hit squad to hunt down homosexuals.

The group were detained when police raided a party at Pongwe Reach after authorities received a tip-off from members of the public. The arrests come days after Paul Makonda, the Regional Commissioner for Dar es Salaam, said an anti-gay surveillance team would be using social media to hunt people down. He also encouraged people to hand over names of anyone they suspected of being gay so authorities could investigate. His comments were subsequently denounced by the Tanzanian government - but homosexuality is still a crime in deeply religious Tanzania and homophobic rhetoric has been on the rise since President John Magufuli was elected in 2015. Seif Magango, East Africa Deputy Director for human rights group Amnesty International, said: "This is a shocking blow following the Tanzanian government's assur-





ance that no-one would be targeted and arrested because of their actual or perceived sexual orientation and gender identity. "This appalling attack on Tanzanian people simply exercising their human rights shows the danger of inflammatory and discriminatory rhetoric at senior levels of government.

"We now fear these men may be subjected to forced anal examination, the government's method of choice for 'proving' same-sex sexual activity among men. This must not be

allowed to happen - these men must be released immediatelv." The 10 men are being held at Chakwal Police Station in Unguja, despite the fact no charges were brought against them. Six others at the party on Saturday night managed to flee from police. Human rights group Amnesty International has established that the men were arrested for allegedly conducting a gay marriage, with police saying they found the men sitting in pairs 'two by two'.

EFF WANTS GIGABA TO BE SENT PACKING

CAPE TOWN - EFF has called for the axing of embattled Home Affairs Minister Malusi Gigaba for allegedly lying under oath on facts surrounding the permission granted to Oppenheimers to operate a private terminal at OR Tambo International Airport. Gigaba appeared

before Parliament's Portfolio Committee on Home Affairs on Tuesday, where he was expected to answer on the decision to grant the Oppenheimers permission and the public protector's report which found that he lied under

oath. EFF MP Hlengiwe Mkhaliphi said following the report by the public protector, and the Constitutional Court ruling dismissing his appeal, Gigaba should be axed.

> "The minister remains a constitutional delinquent because the Constitutional Court has announced and found the minister lying under oath. If we are going to allow the minister today to talk about this Fireblade matter, we are second

guessing the report of the public protector," said Mkhaliphi. Gigaba has

GIGABITES: Malusi Gigaba. denied granting Fireblade Aviation permission to operate a VVIP terminal, contrary to court findings, which he appealed and lost, and a public protector report.

The public protector report recommended that President Cyril Ramaphosa discipline Gigaba for perjuring himself and violating the Constitution as a member of the executive.

He told the committee that talks on the private terminals between government and the Oppenheimers date from 2012.

Gigaba sorry for pinky finger gesture, mentions taking 'strain'

CAPE TOWN - Home Affairs Minister Malusi Gigaba has apologised unreservedly for making a gesture with his pinky finger at an EFF MP during Parliament's volatile sitting on Tuesday.

In a tweet, the minister said that being provoked, combined with the strain he was under, were no excuse for making the gesture. He agreed with another tweet which said the gesture fed into a "toxic masculinity discourse".

"I apologise, unreservedly, for this gesture. The petty taunts that provoked it and the strain I have been taking, over the past 10 days, are no excuse for my indiscretion," which is perfectly summed-up in this tweet.

The pinky gesture was a retort to EFF MP Mbuyiseni Ndlozi's suggestion that cellphones without cameras be given to Cabinet ministers, to avoid their phones being hacked.

To laughter from the EFF benches, Ndlozi said: "Honourable President [Cyril Ramaphosa], you know this phone doesn't have a camera.

"You may want to start ordering it for Cabinet members, because it will save us a lot [from] some of their embarrassing activities.

"It can't even be hacked this phone. Can I come maybe give it to you so you have a model of what phones might be critical for honourable Cabinet members?" It was a reference to the selffilmed tape of Gigaba which leaked last month. The video contained 'content of a sexual nature, 'which Gigaba claimed was released after his phone was hacked. The minister responded to Ndlozi by raising his pinky - a gesture some interpreted to be an insult regarding the MP's penis size.



The incident occurred in the Huriwa district in the north of the city.

16 Nigeria troops missing

NIGERIA - At least 16 Nigerian soldiers are missing following clashes with Boko Haram jihadists in the Lake Chad area, military and militia sources told AFP.

The Islamic State in West Africa (ISWAP) group, a faction of the Boko Haram, claimed responsibility for the attack in which it said 15 soldiers were killed, according to SITE, which tracks the online activities of terrorist organisations. The incident began when gunmen in several trucks attacked a military base and a local market in the town of Kukawa late on Monday, briefly forcing troops out of the base.

Florida returns vote to ex-felons

BLUE WAVE FLOPS

WASHINGTON - The Democrats regained control of the House of Representatives in the American mid-term elections but their anticipated 'blue wave' of support broke just short of the Senate, where Republicans maintained control.

As the final ballots were counted early yesterday, Democrats were projected to take 238 seats in the House, easily topping the 218 needed for a majority and having flipped 26 targets along the way.

But in the Senate, it was a different story with Republicans projected to hold 54 seats needed yesterday to the Democrats' 42, with 51 needed for a majority. Trump called the night a 'tremendous success' on Twitter and praised himself as 'magic', but the reality is that the Democrats will now use their House majority to frustrate his agenda for the remaining two years of his term. Gaining the House also means the Dems gain control of several committees which they could now use to launch investigations into Trump, including subpoenaing tax records he refused to release during the 2016 election.

Despite the gains, the night failed to live up to Democrat expectations with the party failing to gain the maximum number of seats they were projected in the House and losing key governor races, includ-

ing Florida. In Georgia, Democrat Stacey Abrams is refusing to concede in a close race that would make her America's first female black governor. Taylor Swift's intervention also flopped as Marsha Blackburn won the Senate in Tennessee by 26 points over Democrat candidate Phil Bredesen, who the singer backed.

While the Democrats' grass-roots organisation allowed them to seize the House, Trump's showmanship and personality thwarted them in key battleground states of Indiana, Missouri, and Tennessee - where he held rallies in the closing days of the election.

One of the most bitter defeats for

the Democrats came in Texas, where rising star Beto O'Rourke was defeated by incumbent Ted Cruz - a onetime foe of Trump who has since warmed to him - though the contest was closer than anticipated. Another stinging Dem loss came in Florida, Donald Trump's adopted home state, where Ron DeSantis won a seat in the governor's mansion, ahead of Andrew Gillum, despite backing from the likes of P Diddy. In Tennessee, Marsha Blackburn defeated Democrat rival Phil Bredesen by a crushing 26 point margin, despite Taylor Swift denouncing her on Instagram and urging supporters to vote for Bredesen instead. Teachers in Zim threaten to down tools

HARARE - A Zimbabwean teachers union has reportedly declared a nationwide strike over deteriorating working conditions.

According to Daily News, the Progressive Teachers Union of Zimbabwe (PTUZ) said its members were "fed up with a government they see as unresponsive to their concerns".

PTUZ General Secretary Raymond Majongwe said the teachers were set to down tools tomorrow.

"We call upon on our members to fully support our initiative which will be our way of sending an unequivocal message to the employer that we are fed up, hence we can't continue like this because we have tried negotiations but government is insensitive," Majongwe was quoted as saying.

The teachers were expected to gather at the Africa Unity square and march to Psmas offices then to the employers offices at the new government complex and Mukwati building to hand over their petition. Teachers, who made up the major-

ity of government workers in the southern African nation, last month demanded to be paid in US dollars following widespread shortages of basic commodities.

Situation

Other government workers who included doctors had also made similar demands after the worsening economic condition that had led to shortages of basic commodities such as drugs and fuel in recent months.

According to New Zimbabwe.com, public hospital doctors also issued a petition to Health Minister Obadiah Moyo last month, demanding to be paid in the diminishing US dollars.

The Zimbabwe Hospital Doctors Association said that their demands were not new but their situation had been worsened by the country's deteriorating economic situation.

The doctors association said its members were last month paid in RTGS and were unable to access basic commodities, or even travel to work.

Six far-right suspects held over 'plot' against Macron

PARIS - Six people linked to French extreme right movements were detained on Tuesday on suspicions they were preparing a "violent" plot against President Emmanuel Macron, sources close to the case told AFP.

The five men and one woman, aged 22 to 62, were seized by France's DGSI domestic intelligence agency,

which did not release their identities, one of the sources said.

Four suspects were picked up in the northeastern city of Moselle, a little more than an hour's drive from Verdun, which Macron was visiting on Tuesday as part of weeklong commemorations of the World War I centenary.

ABUJA- The Prince of Wales has cut out a stop of a trip to Nigeria over security concerns, following months of deadly clashes between nomadic herders and farmers in the restive region.

They were expected to travel to Nigeria's central city of Jos yesterday, the last day of their stay, to discuss peace-building and conflict resolution. "Due to operational constraints beyond our control, we have decided at this time not to include Jos during their royal highnesses' visit to Nigeria," said a British foreign office spokesperson on Monday. "We are delighted to have an exciting programme of activity in Abuja and Lagos which will showcase those issues close to the prince's and the duchess' hearts," she said.


'UCL is already a Super League'




