Elected MPs less than half in Cabinet

LESS than half of the Cabinet ministers are directly elected from the constituencies.

This is much against the constitutional provision, which calls for at least half of the ministers to be those that were elected from the constituencies. Section 67 (3) says, "At least half the number of ministers shall be appointed from among the elected members of the House

The obtaining situation at Cabinet is that only eight of the 20 members of the Cabinet were elected directly from the people. This means the elected members of the Cabinet account for only 40 per cent of the entire Cabinet team. Even if Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini and Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Themba Nhlanganiso Masuku were not to be considered as ministers, the situation would still be the same. The elected ministers would still not form half of the Cabinet team.

The removal of the two would bring the number of Cabinet ministers to 18. This would then call for at least nine ministers to form part of the Cabinet ministers. With eight of the elected ministers being part of the Cabinet, it shows that still, the number of elected ministers does not form part of the Cabinet.

Among the Cabinet ministers, six senators have been appointed. One of the senators has been the one elected by MPs. This is Minister for Health Lizzy Nkosi. Other senators appointed include DPM Themba Masusku, Mancoba Khumalo (Commerce, Industry and Trade), Princess Sikhanyiso (ICT), Peter Bhembe (Natural Resources and Energy), and Thuli Dladla (Education and Training)

Appointed

The number of MPs making up the Cabinet team is 14, including the prime minister, who is also an MP. Half of the appointed MPs also made it to the Cabinet. They include Ministers Neal Rijkenberg (Finance), Pholile Shakantu (Justice and Constitutional Affairs), Chief Ndlaluhlaza Ndwandwe (Public Works and Transport), Prince Simelane (Housing and Urban Development), and Princess Lindiwe (Home Affairs).

This shows that the Cabinet is formed of legislators from both chambers of Parliament. This is in accordance with Section 67 (2) of the Constitution, which says, "The King shall appoint ministers from both chambers of Parliament on the recommendation of the Prime

COUNTRY HAS MADE PROGRESS IN HUMAN RIGHTS ISSUES

THE country has made progress in addressing some of the concerns and recommendations raised by the United Nations Committee.

This was confirmed by EU ambassador to Eswatini during a breakfast meeting with the Editors Forum of Eswatini on the visit of the Human Rights Delegation to the country. Present during the media engagement at Mountain Inn yesterday, was member of the UN Human Rights Committee, Christof Heyns, Representative of the Centre for Civil and Political Rights, Eswatini Human Rights Commission, Sabelo Masuku, Executive Secretary of the commission Linda Nxumalo and many

The EU ambassador said important achievements had been the revision of the Public Order Act 2017 and the enactment of Sexual Offences and Domestic violence Act. She said the UN human rights committee is expecting a new report from the Kingdom of Eswatini to illustrate the achievements done since 2017 and the challenges in implementing the recommendations made on the three areas mentioned before.

"We have encouraged the country to consult and involve the civil society and non-governmental organisations in the preparations of this report.

that government demonstrated a willingness to embrace this approach as it will without any doubt enrich the quality of the state report," she said.

She also thanked the Eswatini Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration and the Eswatini Civil Organisations on their positive involvement on this progress to renew the European Union support to the new Government of the Kingdom of Eswatini in preparations of the human rights necessary reports so the country would be able to report factually and timely.

She also highlighted that in the past three days, the European Union engaged members of the UN Human Rights Delegation, the Eswatini Commission on Human Rights and public administration, government officials and civil society organisations on the subject of human rights which is the central to their work globally.

"Our dialogue with the government and civil society under Article of the Cotonou Agreement which we always hold annually gives us the opportunity to take stock and assess the progress made on the issues of democracy and human rights in the country." she added.

She said the EU financed developmental programmes and projects also contribute to the fulfilment of partner countries, international human rights obligation. including the recommendations put forward by the UN treaty bodies during the Universal Periodic Review as well as other monitoring

law and in practice.

"The state party should continue and step up interventions to address the needs of key populations, in particular women, youth, sex workers and the lesbian, gay, and bisexual, transgender and intersex community, including people in the rural

The state should also redouble its efforts to combat the high level of HIV/AIDS related discrimination among the general population. "The country should also

ensure that discrimination against people with HIV/AIDS is legally prohibited in all contexts and that such laws are enforced effectively in practice," he added.

He also mentioned that the state take steps to ensure that persons with albinism are protected, in law and in practice, against all forms of violence and discrimination. "The state party has yet to adopt effective strategies to ensure that persons with albinism are afforded equal protection in law and in practice," he said.

Births are unregistered

WHILE noting the measures taken by the State to ensure that all births are registered, the committee remains concerned by the large number of births that remain unregistered.

Member of the UN Human Rights Committee, Christof Heyns said, the State party should expedite its efforts to register all births on its territory and continue to mount public and family awarenessraising campaigns concerning birth registration, particularly in rural areas.

Establish

"The State should also take measures to establish juvenile chambers with trained judges to ensure that juveniles are treated in a manner commensurate with their age, specific needs and vulnerability," he

He said the correctional services in the country should raise the minimum age of criminal responsibility in accordance with international standards and ensure the full implementation of international standards for juvenile justice. They should ensure that children are kept separate from adults in detention.

AUSTERITY measures should continue to be implemented in order for the economy to fully recover.

This was said by Minister of Housing and Urban Development Prince Simelane when expressing his view on what the country should do in order to recover in economic terms.

Prince Simelane said he wished that people could understand that the country was currently undergoing financial difficulties and increasing salaries could have a negative impact on the economy.

Minister: Increments should stop

The prince started saying this last week at Mandvulo Grand Hall in Lozitha. That was when legislators had gone there to meet His Majesty King Mswati III. Interested

The King was also interested in gathering opinions from the lawmakers on what the country had to do in order to turn around the bad economic situation. The prince said people had to adjust themselves to suit the prevailing economic circumstances and accept that workers would have to go for some years without any increment in terms of payment.

Prince Simelane was also called on Wednesday and he maintained his stand on what he submitted at Mandvulo. Prince Simelane said the International Monetary Fund (IMF) advised the country to lay off some workers from the civil service because it could not sustain them. However, the King could not do so because he was concerned that the unemployment rate would be high.

The King's decision came with conditions, according to the minister. The conditions

were that civil servants would have to go for many years without any increment, in order to try and follow the advice of the IMF.

Pleaded


He pleaded with the workers to adjust and live under the tough economic circumstances, hoping that the situation would come to pass. Prince Simelane's sentiments were shared by Deputy Prime Minister (DPM) Themba Masuku, in a separate occasion. Masuku met his staff members at his offices on Wednesday

for introductions so that he could get to know them and establish a rapport with them.

Masuku also pleaded with his workers to adjust themselves to suit the prevailing tough economic circumstances for the country. He told them that in life, there were good and bad circumstances, which called for everyone to adjust to suit whatever circumstances.

He told the workers that he understood that every person wanted money, but money should not be the priority. He said the reason why his workers were at work should be to serve the people. rather than prioritising money and status of working at DPMO.

EDITORIFIULANI THALAPASSES ON

IT is a sad day for the media landscape in the

Veteran and shrewd editor of the Swazi Observer Group of Newspapers Thulani Thwala has passed

Thwala's sudden and shocking death occurred in the early hours of yesterday at the Mbabane government hospital where he had been rushed to after collapsing.

His tragic death spread like wild fire yesterday at the capital city, with perplexed journalists, friends and relatives asking themselves many unanswered questions.

Experience

Thwala, a seasoned journalist polished by 23 years of newsroom experience, died shortly after editing yesterday's copy of the Swazi Observer, which happened to be his last publication in this lifetime.

The Swazi Observer newsroom, which had become Thwala's second home for many years, was characterised by untold scenes of extreme grief and deep sorrow for the whole of yesterday, with shattered employees constantly sobbing and battling to come to terms with the sudden death of the man they had grown to love and respect over the years.

Before he met his sudden demise, Mr. T, as he was affectionately known, was his usual joyful self on Wednesday, cracking jokes with everybody in the newsroom. He left the newsroom at around 11: 45pm after putting the paper to bed, telling some of his colleagues that he was going to his house to celebrate the win of his favourite soccer team, Mbabane Highlanders which had

beaten Green Mamba 2 – 1.

This was to be his last presence in the newsroom. He died at the Mbabane government hospital hardly two hours later.

The cause of his shocking death is still unknown. His brother Shaka Thwala, in an interview yesterday, confirmed the death of the long-serving

A teary Shaka was at a loss for words as he confirmed the demise of the man who has made his name as one of the finest journalists this country

has ever produced in recent history. "Words cannot describe how we feel right now. We have too many unanswered questions. But

God knows and only He knows the reason why this has happened. We can only send our condolences to his friends and colleagues in the media industry that he has worked for with distinct excellence for many years. Thulani was a people's person and, as they say, it takes a village to raise a child. It is for this reason that w e

Swazi Observer family because Thulani spent many hours of his life at the Swazi Observer than at home," he stated.

Shaka said further details about Thwala's memorial and subsequent burial will be communicated to the public in due course.

Managing Director of the Swazi Observer Group of Newspapers Alan Mkhonta also expressed shock at the news of Thwala's passing and conveyed his condolences to his family.

Sorrow

"It is with deep regret, sorrow and extreme sadness that the Board of Directors, Management and Staff of the Swazi Observer Group of Newspapers announce the painful and sudden passing of our beloved editor Mr Thulani Thwala on Thursday, November 8, 2018. We wish to extent our profound condolences to all staff and particularly to his family and many

> friends. We have lost a great leader and team player who was very good in his craft. We are still shocked by what has happened," he said.

Mkhonta described Thwala's demise as a terrible catastrophe that has befallen the company, his family and friends.

SISHAYEKILE -**EDITOR'S FORUM**

THE Editors' Forum of Eswatini says it has been shattered by the sudden death of one of their own in Thulani Thwala.

Secretary General of the Forum, Jabu Matsebula said the organisation is still shocked beyond measure by Thwala's demise. "This is unbelievable. It is terrible, actually. We knew Thulani was not a very healthy man but we never anticipated this so soon. We were communicating with him just yesterday. In fact, today (yesterday) we had a particular occasion at the Mountain Inn and we were expecting him to be there. We were shocked when we arrived there only to be informed by one of our members that he had passed on. Thwala was a very valuable editor. The last time we were with him was last week at the Mountain Inn at another event. He was very jolly, cracking neverending jokes as usual. Little did we know that he was bidding us farewell," he said.

Matsebula also sent his condolences to Thwala's family, friends and the Swazi Observer family in its entinety. Acting President of the Swaziland National Association of Journalists (SNAJ) Mfanukhona Nkambule shared the same sentiments. Nkambule described Thwala as a motivational leader. "Thwala used mostly what is referred to as motivational leadership. He would discipline you while smiling and thereafter laugh with you as if nothing had happened. He was also full of humour. Wherever he was, there was always laughter. He was a people's person," he said.

BRIEFLY ABOUT THULANI THWALA

Thulani Thwala was employed by the Swazi Observer as a cub reporter in 1995. He worked here for five years until the company closed down in 2000.

Thereafter, he moved to the Times of Swaziland where he worked for 10 years. Due to his excellence in the art of news reporting, Thwala received recognition from senior managers at the Times such as the late Vusie Roy Ginindza who quickly facilitated his rise into senior positions. He occupied the position of News Editor, a position he held until he was again elevated to the position of Editor of the Swazi News, a Saturday publication, sometime around 2004. Thwala held this position until he resigned from the Times in 2010 and re-joined the Swazi Observer as Editor. He held this position until the early hours of yesterday when he passed away, leaving members of the profession he has served with such great distinction in complete shock and dismay.

Matsapha mayor adjourns meeting before vote of no confidence on him

THERE was drama at the Matsapha Town Council meeting on Wednesday night when councillors tried to move a motion of no confidence against Mayor Sandlane Zwane.

The mayor had to quickly adjourn the heated meeting before councillors could pass a vote of no confidence. One of the attendees of the meeting revealed that the mayor allegedly abused his unopposed motions and stopped the meeting before the vote of no confidence could be effected. The mayor is alleged to have written a letter to one councillor, accusing him of demanding bribe from a company that supplies tracksuits, and another councillor was accused of interfering with audits at the council.

When the vote of no confidence motion was moved, Zwane is alleged to have told the meeting that the people who were moving the motion were conflicted as they still had disciplinary

When contacted yesterday, Zwane said he beat them in their own game and they failed to achieve their objective which was to slap him with the vote of no confidence.

Confident

He said that they were confident prior to the meeting, telling him that they had prepared a stew for him, 'but they eventually ate that stew'

'I told them to show course why I shouldn't discipline them on allegations of corruption. They want to charge, convict and sentence me on issues that touch on them. There is no motion that you can move on allegations but one has to provide evidence before moving a motion of no confidence," he said. Zwane accused the councillors of being inexperienced, and further revealed that he had since slapped them with a motion of suspension.

PM not meeting unions for salary negotiations

IT has been clarified that the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini will not be meeting unions for salary issues.

This comes after reports that the PM had invited leaders of Public Sector Associations (PSAs) which comprises of the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT), Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU), National Public Service and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) and Swaziland National Government Accounting Personnel (SNAGAP) to a meeting and the speculation that the meeting would be about the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA) which has been a thorn on government's flesh since August. However, a statement from government's spokesperson Percy Simelane clarifies that the PM will be meeting social

partners comprising the Federation of Eswatini Employers, Public Service Associations and the Federation of Eswatini Business Community and the meeting is scheduled for today.

"Following misleading reports to the effect that the Hon. Prime Minister, Mr. Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini has invited Public Service Unions to thrash out salary issues we wish to state the following:

The meetings are a means of familiarising the Prime Minister with Government's key social partners. They are a courtesy platform not a salary negotiating forum. It is not true that Mr.

Dlamini will be meeting one particular social partner with a view to discuss salaries for the Public Sector. We will continue to encourage Government's Social Partners to communicate to the public responsibly and avoid making unwarranted perceptions which end up being published yet they are misleading and untruthful," says the statement.



SUSPECT RHINO POACHERS' TRIAL SET FOR NOVEMBE

FOLLOWING a pre-trial conference held at the High Court two months ago, the trial of the four suspect rhino poachers including a South African Police Service (SAPS) officer has now been set for November 19.

The trial has been allocated three days beginning November 19 through to 21.

The crown has lined up nine witnesses for the case.

According to the summons addressed to the witnesses, they are commanded to lay aside all and singular business and excuses and appear personally before the High Court of Eswatini on the three days set at 0900 hours to testify all and singular those things they know concerning the indictment of the suspects Stanley Nhlakalufu (SAPS) Muzi Dlamini (Swazi) Sipho Mhlanga (Swazi) and Isaac Mkhabela (South African).

This means that the three will know their fate soon as they are still languishing in jail.

Opposed

Following their admission to bail fixed at E50 000, the crown filed an appeal where the crown represented by Patrick Mkhatjwa stated that the court aquo erred in law in refusing to hear evidence viva voce to clarify issues that were in dispute as it had opposed the bail application by the four.

The crown further stated in its appeal that the court aquo erred in admitting the four suspects to bail.

In its opposing papers during the bail application, the crown had submitted that the four were a flight risk with two of them being South African nationals.

High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi ordered that they pay E5 000 in cash each and E45 000 each in a form of a surety. Judge Nkosi attached stringent conditions to the bail and amongst them is that they are to report to the nearest police on a daily basis pending their trial at the High Court.

The crown had initially opposed the bail application filed by the court stating that they are a flight risk.

The four are facing a total of 14 counts which were allegedly committed during the attempted poaching at Hlane Game Park's Jubela Reilly amongst witnesses

The main charge is that of contravening the Game Act in that they allegedly entered the game park and attempted to poach the rhino.

Additional charges of murder and contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act amongst others were added by the

According to Detective Sergeant Bheki Shabangu of Simunye Police Station, in his answering affidavit, investigations revealed that the mastermind in the rhino poaching deal was the fourth accused Mhlanga who is alleged to have approached the Gamer Ranger Fana Mbatha and orchestrated the plan to poach the rhino.

Shabangu stated his investigations further revealed that Mbatha was called by Mhlanga and enquired if the coast was clear on the day of the poaching and Mbatha replied to the affirmative and the team of poachers, involving Mhlanga and two Mozambican national who died during the incident drove into the game park to execute the poach-

Patrolling

They drove in motor vehicle registered DSD 389 CM and Mhlanga was the one driving because he had knowledge of the map at Hlane Royal Game Park as a local resident and knew that there were no locked gates save for a no entry signage reserved for members of the public.

At around 1am a motor vehicle was noticed inside the game park and detective Shabangu who was investigating the suspected poaching realised that the poachers had been able to enter without being noticed using a route not permitted to the public.

Rangers who were patrolling on foot according to Shabangu tried to stop the poachers' vehicle but they did not heed to the call but instead opened fire to the direction of the rangers on patrol resulting in a cross fire between the poachers and the rangers including Jubela who was part of them.

The members of the patrolling team are said to have bravely advanced towards the poachers' motor vehicle only to find that one of the poachers had been shot

and a search ensued as they had noticed that there was more than one occupant in the vehicle.

Found in the vehicle was an empty cartridge, a magazine, loaded firearm with 13 live rounds of ammunition, knives, silencer, axe and bags. The search team was able find another poacher with the assistance of sniffer dogs and both the poachers found shot were already dead.

Lookout

"We received a 999 Police Emergency line report from a man who identified himself as Sipho Mhlanga who asked that the police assist in conveying him to hospital and stated that he would be found at Hlane, indeed we proceeded to the spot where he directed us and we rushed him to Good Shepherd Hospital," Shabangu stated.

Mhlanga and another man identified as Mandlanti Shabangu were apprehended through the use of sniffer dogs.

Because of the information he had detective Shabangu stated that he called another patrolling motor vehicle and informed the police officers to be on the lookout as there were two motor vehicles used in the poaching and the other vehicle was a Toyota Corolla registered HDY 266 MP.

Detective Shabangu stated in his papers that indeed the vehicle was found being driven by Isaac Mkhabela and ordered that the vehicle and its occupants be driven to Simunye Police Station together with passports of the deceased Lucky Mandlati Shabangu and Castigo Jaime Zucula as well as those of Nhlakalufu and Mkhabela. The shooting of the patrolling team according to Shabangu was lawful and not a cover up as argued by the applicants in the bail application.

Child thrasher sentenced to spend 3 years in jail

THE woman who thrashed a seven-year-old girl who was playing with her child has been sentenced to three years in a correctional facility.

Sebenzile Nkosi trashed the minor with a stick and landed her in hospital with a blocked eye and bruis-

Temazomba Dube was thrashed by her playmate's mother around September after her playmate aged five cried.

The two minors were playing at an amateur day care centre at Mhlaleni in Matsapha when the two disagreed on something which ended with the five-year-old crying.

That child's cry for help is said to have forced her mother to come running to enquire what the problem was.

The now frightened minors are said to have all pointed their fingers to Temazomba when they were questioned on why the five-yearold was crying.

The infuriated mother grabbed a stick and severely thrashed the girl. resulting to a bruised and blocked eye, bruises all over her body.

Yesterday, Nkosi appeared before the Manzini Magistrate's Court and was given a E3 500 fine option. Nkosi has been held in the Mawelawela Correctional Services since September for the assault of the minor.

Disagree

Meanwhile, Temazomba's father Mabandla Dube said he was happy that her child's attacker finally got what she deserved.

"Children always disagree when they play, but that does not give parents the right to interfere and beat other children," Dube said.

The minor's mother, Fikile Shabangu said her neighbour did not have any regrets and boasted about meeting in court.

"Her child is not left with injury marks like mine, the children were only playing and there was no need to beat her like this.

It will take a while before the bruises vanish completely from her body." said Shabangu.

Truck drivers raise over E4 000 to help ferry corpse to Eswatini

IN a bid to help transport a corpse of one of their own, local truck drivers based in South Africa have mobilised over E4 000 amongst themselves for Zweli Gamedze to be laid to rest at Mpolonjeni.

He died tragically after being thrown under a moving truck in South Africa.

Being an orphan who lost both his parents and only survived by his grandparents, funds to ferry his body from the neighbouring country to Eswatini proved a huge problem for his grandparents.

Bigboy Magagula, one of the local truck drivers in SA said they were also doing amends to help the situation by contributing financially even though they had not gathered much thus far but they

were hopeful that the money would be enough to cover the costs.

"We have raised a sum amounting to over E4 000 thus far and contributions are still trickling in. One of us will take the money to his family in Eswatini today and arrangements to have the deceased's body ferried home are ongoing. We are hopeful that his funeral will be held this coming weekend," he said.

Gamedze has spent over a week in South after his death on September 29. The deceased's grandmother, Gogo Mkhonta said the corpse was still in South Africa at Hillbrow mortuary and the family was still trying to arrange transportation to the country with financial constraints deferring them. The company he worked for allegedly gave the family only E7 000, which was the deceased's monthly salary yet the cost of ferrying a corpse is reportedly E8 000.



MURDER CASES INCREASE BY 12% WITHIN A MONT

ABOUT 100 people have been murdered in the country since January until last month.

According to data collected from the Royal Eswatini Police (REP) Services, there were 86 murder victims between the months of January and October, meaning 14 more people were murdered within a month.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said they had noted the rise of murder cases with great concern. Vilakati said it was disheartening that Eswatini had all along been classified as a peaceful country but had now turned into a violent one.

She said some of these murders were caused by disagreements between related persons or intimate partners.

Vilakati said some situations might be hard and infuriating to handle, but violence is not the way deal with it.

She pleaded with those who are hurt not to resort to violence but rather make use of available structures that deal with such matters which include police stations, churches, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), psycho-therapists and government hospitals.

'Communication is a therapy on its own. Your problems and your anger are nothing new in the world," Vilakati

Meanwhile, the Coordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations (CANGO) Communications Officer Nkosingiphile Myeni said the escalating rate of gruesome killings called for a multi-sectoral national strategy to prevent violence, including putting restrictions to weapons such as fire-arms.

Myeni said the country needs to treat violence as a public health concern and use campaigns and technology to reach every child and family across the coun-

"Developing tools to make sure that everybody feels important and cared for through parenting interventions, family interventions, wellbeing campaigns, and early childhood education can make an impact," he said.

He said there were complex factors that could lead one to take someone else's life or attempt to do so. However, clarifying that no one was obligated to take another person's life no matter the reason behind.

"We call for protective measures whereby there are early signs' detections and mental disorder treatment, provision of information to access to psycho-social support, and school-based preventions as well as other institutions," he said.

Meanwhile, International Mental Health Resource Services (IMERSE) Programme Director Dumsani Mamba said violent behaviour could be linked to mental health, whether the perpetrator was mentally disturbed or they were on the receiving end of metal distortion from someone else's behaviour towards them.

He advised that people should seek help when they are confronted with issues that they feel are too much for them to handle and not at any point should an act of violence be a resolution to any problem that one is faced with.

Myeni said an individual might feel pushed to a corner by a number of problems leading to depression, such as the feeling of unshared pain and hopelessness that can either be social, economic or political.

Plans to block buses if they charge less

THERE is reportedly a plan to have all buses that will not effect the imminent fare hike blocked using the Nhlangano bus terminus.

Kombi drivers servicing long routes such as Nhlangano -Mbabane and Nhlangano-Manzini are reportedly considering stopping all the buses which charge lower fares which they feel are threatening their business.

One of the drivers said it had been a long time since the 'big' buses effected new public transport fares.

Petition

"We know some of these buses are operated by companies and they tell us that they do what is good for them. On the other hand, we are employees and the competition we get from these buses

"There has to be a way we can deal with all the buses which do not effect the agreed fares which reflect in the gazette. We cannot allow these people to give us unfair competition.

"Overcharging, yes it's not

allowed but to charge far too low than what is in the gazette, is also unfair to some of us," said one of the kombi drivers servicing Nhlangano/Manzini routes.

On the other hand, Chairman of the Shiselweni Transport Association Jika Ndlangamandla said it would not be a good thing to block the buses as they were operating legally.

He said he was not aware that there was a plan to block any of the buses charging less than what kombis charge

"If there are people planning to block buses for charging low fares, then those doing that should know that they will be dealt with by the law.

"It's a crime to disturb someone who is doing business legally. Charging less is not a crime but overcharging it is a crime," said Ndlangamandla.

Ndlangamandla said no one should take the law into their own hands but if there was an issue that needs to be addressed, all procedures should be followed.

"Resorting to use of violence or force is not a solution but we need to sort things out harmoniously," said Ndlangamandla.

Elderly man dies after drinking umcombotsi

RESIDENTS of Mambane have been left speculating after an elderly man of the area mysteriously died a few moments after drinking a traditional brew (umcombotsi) from a local drinking spot.

The man's wife is also reported to be sickly as she also had a few sips from the same jar of the brew which her husband drank before dying a couple of hours later.

The incident which has left residents in shock happened on Wednesday afternoon.

The deceased has been identified by family members as December Mahlangu (68). Sources close to the matter disclosed that he went to a drinking spot which normally sells traditional

The spot is situated about 200 metres away from his homestead.

As a norm, Mahlangu went there together with his wife. The couple is said to have had a few jars of umcombotsi before calling it a day.

While on their way home, the deceased and his wife are said to have entered into a homestead

which is situated less than 100 metres from the drinking spot, and negotiated for shelter as it was now raining heavily.

A relative who identified himself as Matsenjwa said the deceased complained of a severe stomach-ache whilst waiting for the rain to subside. The two eventually went to their homestead late in the evening where the deceased' condition worsened.

He is said to have later died while his family was still trying to give him home made remedies. By yesterday, the deceased' wife was also reported to be sickly, suffering from stomach-ache and

The death of the elderly man and the subsequent sickly condition of his wife has left residents of the area wondering about the cause of his death. Matsenjwa said the matter was still being deliberated at family level, and had not been reported to any authority.

In the meantime, indvana of Mambane umphakatsi Dumsani Matsenjwa confirmed receiving a report of an elderly man who died mysteriously.

"I can confirm the death of Mahlangu as members of the family have reported same, but they have not yet registered a complaint of any sort regarding his demise," said Matsenjwa.







Ministry of Health against legalisation of marijuana

Manzini

THE ministry of health is against the call by many to legalise marijuana in the country.

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Health Dr Simon Zwane said there was no way the country could achieve mental health if it is going to legalise the use of marijuana.

He was speaking during the commemoration of the World Mental Health Day held at The George Hotel yesterday.

Zwane said substance use damages the country's youth.

The PS said young people from the age of 14 to 29 are drowning in alcohol because of the bars littered all over the country.

He said it would be sad to hear that a health practitioner also runs a bar selling alcohol while at the same time saying the country is fighting mental health problems.

On that note, World Health Organisation (WHO) Officer in Charge Dr Khosi Mthethwa also shared the Principal Secretary's sentiments on dagga. Presenting statistics during her speech Mthethwa said according to the Global School-based Student Health Survey conducted among learners aged 13 and 17 years in Eswatini in 2014.

The findings revealed that about one in 15 adolescents use marijuana once or more times in their life times and more than half of these start using it before the age of 14 years.

She said it had been also sad to note that about one in six adolescent attending school has no close friends.

"This can lead to loneliness which can cause depression and suicide. Actually about 20 per cent of young people seriously consider attempting

suicide every year. Suicide is the second leading cause of death among 15-29 year-olds globally," Mthethwa said.

She said mental health problems affect about one in 10 children and young people.

The officer in charge said these problems include depression, self-harm, anxiety disorders, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), eating disorders, bullying just to mention a few.

All hope is not lost however as according to Mthethwa, the good news is that there are simple things that could help keep children and young people mentally well.

She said young people are encouraged to eat a balanced diet, get regular exercise to keep physically fit and have enough sleep.

Mthethwa said families need to get along well most of the time for the sake of young people, she added that schools should look after the wellbeing of all its learners.

She said children and adolescents with mental disorders often face stigma and limited access to health care and education, in violation of their human rights.

"Young people have a right to privacy if they do not want to talk to you about their conversations with professionals, but you should still respond sensitively if they seem to be upset. Young people are however encouraged to open up to their parents-have a warm, open relationship with their parents," Mthethwa said.

She said if a pupil is having problems at school, a teacher, school nurse, school counsellor or educational psychologist may be able to help.

She urged pupils to talk their problems through.

She added that organisations that can help are also available in the country. Mthethwa said as the country celebrates World Mental Health Day, she would like to call upon the government of the Vinedom of Equation to

ment of the Kingdom of Eswatini to develop and strengthen evidence-based programmes for young people, with the support of national policy-makers and programme managers.

She invited interested partners and civil society to continue collaborating with the government and WHO to improve the response to adolescents' health needs.

Mental health policy task team set up

THE ministry of health has since appointed seven people to work on drafting a mental health policy that will be submitted to Cabinet for discussion within the next six months.

The appointment was made by the Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Health Dr Simon Zwane at The George Hotel during the commemoration of World Mental Health Day. The PS said the country needs a policy dedicated to mental health.

Zwane said the lack of a Mental Health Policy in the country was an embarrassment.

He said that was why the ministry had since decided to appoint independent individuals who will work on finalising the issue of the policy.

Zwane said in six months' time, the policy should be ready for discussion at Cabinet. Worth noting is that this is not the first time the issue of mental health policy has been raised. International Mental Health Resource Services (IMERSE) which is the only non-governmental organisation focused on promotion of mental health and prevention of mental disorders in the country once raised this issue.

The organisation revealed that little was known about mental health in Eswatini, but there were indicators that many Emaswati suffer from mental disorders. The organisation stated that mental health services in Eswatini were limited as only one psychiatrist service the entire country.

"The National Psychiatric Referral Hospital in Manzini, in the central part of the country, is the only government entity in the country that offers mental health services," part of the organisation's report reads. It also stated that there were

no ongoing mental health refresher courses, workshops, and conferences available to psychiatric staff. The report further points out that many primary health workers lack basic knowledge on mental health, with majority of clinics having no manuals on how to manage and treat mental disorders. The organisation also pointed out that there was no mental health policy in Eswatini, and the mental health legislation was outdated, having last been revised in 1978.

Old Trade Fair turned into a sex der

THE old Trade Fair has turned into a sex den.

The facility has also been turned into a haven for all unacceptable

behaviour, as a result, the municipality has since decided to crack the whip on whosoever will be found trespassing at the place.

SICK ROBBERY SUSPECT 'MAGOJOGOJO' WANTS OUT OF JAIL

ROBBERY suspect Francis 'Magojogojo' Sibiya whose bail was revoked by two magistrates after being held in contempt while on bail, says he is sick and wants out of jail.

Sibiya has filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court where he is seeking an order of court reviewing and setting aside the ruling by the respondents (Magistrates Sindi Zwane and Siphosini Dlamini) for revoking his bail.

Sibiya also seeks an order of court setting aside the warrants of arrest issued by the two magistrates against him and further directing that he be released from custody on the same terms and conditions as previously granted by them subsequent to failure to allegedly prosecute him on the charge of contempt of court.

He submitted that the matter was urgent in that as a sickly person he requires a special diet not provided in prison and is further not getting the necessary constant medical attention which he requires while in custody.

Sibiya is represented by Mbabane based Lawyer Noncedo Ndlangamandla of Mabila Attorneys in Association with N. Ndlangamandla and S. Jele in the matter.

Charged with two counts of robbery, one of theft by false pretenses and the other for contempt, the suspect in his affidavit submitted that he was arrested by the Manzini and Pigg's Peak police for the said offences on different occasions.

He submitted that he was duly admitted to bail by the respondents and released from custody.

He said he continued attending his normal remands until August 18, 2017 when he was supposed to appear before magistrate Zwane but could not since he was allegedly indisposed.

"I attended hospital since I had seriously fallen ill and was given some days off, I did not get better and continued going to hospital such that I could not be in court on September 27, 2017 when I was supposed to appear before the second respondent (Dlamini)," he submitted.

THE SUSPECT'S CHARGES

Manzini offences

- On the first count Sibiya (31) is charged together with Abel Fabiao Chana (43) with contempt of court in that upon or about August 18, 2017 at or near Manzini Magistrate Court the accused persons unlawfully and intentionally violate the dignity and reputation of the court by failing to appear while dully warned to do so.
- On the second count accused one and two are charged with the offence of robbery in that upon August 21, 2016 at or near Sibovu area in Manzini acting jointly in furtherance of a common purpose, they intentionally used force and violence (pepper spray) to rob Ibrahim Variyava, taking from him property valued at E36 000.

PIGGS PEAK OFFENCES

- On the first count Sibiya is charged with the offence of robbery in that on Independence day in 2016 at or near Mangwaneni he allegedly robbed Bangladesh national Anis Siddique items valued at E10 500.
- On count two at Mangwaneni on the same day he allegedly robbed Hussein Anwar of Pakistani and took from his possession items valued at E8 200.
- On count three at Msunduza he allegedly stole by false pretenses a brush cutter from Hlobsile Tsabedze as he pretended to buy same thereby stealing the brush cutter worth E8 500
- On the last count he is charged with contempt of court in that on September 7, 2017 at Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court he violated the dignity and repute of the court by failing to appear while duly warned to do so.

LAW

He said a warrant of arrest was therefore issued against him by both the first and second respondents and was subsequently rearrested by both the Manzini and Pigg's Peak police on a charge of contempt of court. He informed

the court that he was of the impression that he was going to plead

to the charge of contempt and have it dealt with during his bail but that was not the case and he was sent back to jail in May, 2018 and has been in custody since

Sibiya submitted that he had been advised and verily believes that the first and second respondents should have immediately dealt with the contempt of court charges immediately upon his re-arrest to determine whether he was guilty of same or not.

He stated that the rationale behind this was that if he would be acquitted on the contempt charges, he would be entitled to release from custody on the same terms and conditions he was given when bail was granted to

The failure to deal with the contempt of court charges for a period exceeding six months according to Sibiya is itself an irregularity which should warrant the High Court to have

He submitted that this is more so because he had a reasonable and probable explanation for his failure to attend

from custody.

The complainant said the man however suddenly placed a knife on her neck and ordered her to walk into a nearby bush where he allegedly raped


The man is said to have then dashed away from the scene after the act.

THE life of a 15 year old school girl from St Phillips is hanging by the thread as her health deteriorates by the day while she awaits the release of funds from Phalala Fund for her to undergo treatment in South Africa.

Nokuphila Matse, a grade six pupil of Sibetsaphi Primary School has since dropped out of school as her knee swelling condition gets worse by the day. She is one of the many patients who cannot access treatment because government is still trying to resolve payment issues with most South African hospitals which are owed millions for services rendered to locals through the Fund.

The father of the child, Andreas Matse said they were now helpless and had been trying to get help almost everywhere in a bid to save the life of his child. He was found at the God Never Fails (GNF) Ministries in Matsapha where he had taken the child for prayer from Bishop ND Nhlapho who always conducts prayer and deliverance services every Thursday. He said they believed God would intervene and deliver his daughter from the illness which started as an injury on the knee.

Swell

Explaining how it all started, he said the child got a knee injury while coming from school early in the year. She was taken to hospital where she was treated and discharged but five months later, her condition changed with the knee starting to swell.

"Five months later, her right knee started swelling and it is getting worse by the day. We took her to Good Shepherded Hospital where they transferred her to the Mbabane Government Hospital.

A number of tests were conducted and the results eventually revealed that there was a cancer condition which surprised us since this was just an ordinary injury.

We were told that she would be taken for treatment outside the country but we had to wait since there are still monetary related issues with the SA hospitals.

We have done all the necessary paperwork for the child to go for treatment but the trip is still on hold. We are in a desperate situation because the health of the child gets worse by the day," he said.

He said the child is now unable to walk and is losing appetite, something which has got her parents worried. He said they were hoping the issue would be sorted soon to save the life of their little girl. He said anyone who can assist is also welcome to contact him on 7614 3991 because they are not sure when the Phalala Fund issue will be sorted.



MAN ARRESTED FOR RAPING HIS DAUGHTER (5)

A 30-year-old male of Mankayane area has been charged with the rape of his five-year-old biological daughter.

Philani Tfwala stood before magistrate Sifiso Vilakati to answer for contravening section 3 (1) (2) (3) as read with section (9) (a) of the sexual offences and domestic violence Act15 of 2018. When the suspect was informed about his rights to legal representation he responded by stating before the honourable court that he would be seeking legal representation. Crown representetive Chris Sibandze applied that the accused person be remanded into police custody util the 16 of November pending resetting of trial date before the Principal magistrate.

Sifiso Vilakati put it to the accused that he has been charged with a serious offence and therefore advised him to move a bail application at the High Court.

The dispicable incident is said to have occured during the month of October at Mahwalala. Take further note that the offence is accompanied by aggravating factors as envisaged by section 185 B of the criminal proceedure and evidence Act 67 of 1938 in that the accused is a father of the complainant and that she is only five years old. He was remanded into custody as per the crown's application.

Duo arrested for cattle theft denied bail

TWO suspects on Wednesday appeared before the magistrate's court after they were arrested and charged for the theft of three cattle.

Vusi Mangwe (39) of Ngcina and Almond Matsaba (35) of Mhlumeni were said to have stolen three cattle totaling to the value of E16 500. During their appearance before court, the accused elected to conduct their own defense. The accused persons' application for bail was opposed as the Crown stated that further investigations were underway.

Meanwhile, Benice Manjomo (34) of Malawi was charged with contravening section 10 of the theft of motor vehicle Act 16 of 1991. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully driven a motor vehicle, an Isuzu truck bearing a false registration plate while at Mhlumeni Border Gate.

He pleaded guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence in the matter. His plea was also accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence. During mitigation, Manjomo told the court that the vehicle actually belonged to him. He said he was transporting goods to Malawi when he was arrested at the border gate. He was accordingly found guilty by the court and was sentenced to 12 months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.

Court cases in limbo as cops snub courts to invigilate exams

A number of cases at the Manzini Magistrate's Courts are currently stalling as magistrates are informed that investigating officers are not present to provide evidence.

Most officers are reportedly held up invigilating the on-going external examinations.

Suspects who are hoping for speedy trials are always disappointed when remanded back into custody and told to return to court on another set date. Some of the suspects who appeared before Manzini Magistrate Nelsiwe Hlophe on Tuesday were told to come back on another date. One of the suspects who couldn't even afford bail was told that he was being remanded back into police custody as the officer who was supposed to lead evidence was invigilating examinations.

The decision by government to let police officers invigilate the examinations instead of teachers came after teachers made it clear that they would not be invigilating because government was refusing to meet their demands

in term of the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA) whereby the teachers are demanding 6.5 per cent from government.

The non-availability of police officers in court has had a lot of negative implications not only in the smooth running of courts but also on many assignments which are supposed to be carried out by the officers posted in the different examination centres.



The Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) has also condemned the move by government saying they are not trained to deal with school children.

Poor drainage system causing traffic jam at Mahhala

THE poor drainage system at the Mahhala traffic circle in Matsapha continues to be a headache for motorists who are subjected to major traffic jams when it rains.

The traffic jam is so horrible that it starts as far as Lozitha heading to Matsapha and motorists endure a total standoff along the road owing to the drainage issue.

Drainage issues usually relate to standing or ponding water.

Other drainage issues can be the result of basement water or marshy soils.

The primary purpose of a road drainage system is to remove water from the road and its surroundings but there is obviously a fault with the drainage system at Matsapha.

On Tuesday evening, for instance, traffic came to a standstill along the Lozitha – Mahhala route due to the heavy traffic.

The heavy traffic was caused by the fact that traffic police officers had to close the road below the bridge due to the flooding.

One of the public transport

operators interviewed at Mahhala said that when heavy rains hit the city, it becomes bad for business because the ponding water makes it difficult for them to offload customers on the side of the road where they usually stop to drop off passengers.

"There is a need for government to attend to this issue because it doesn't only cause traffic jams but can trigger accidents.

The ponding water rises to a level that makes it difficult for vehicle's mobility causing a standoff particularly under the bridge and we have been enduring this situation for a very long time with the hope that it will be attended to," he said.

Newly appointed Minister of Public Works and Transport Chief Ndlaluhlaza said that as much as they had just been inducted, their obligation was to apply a pace that will see development implemented.

However, he referred questions to the ministry's Principal Secretary Makhosini Mndawe who couldn't be drawn for comment on the matter as his phone rang unanswered after several attempts to reach him.

EPTC runs out of copper as copper thieves strike

AS the Eswatini Post and Telecommunications Corporation continues to be rocked by the problem of copper theft, it has since been revealed that in the month of February and March, copper theft was so rife the company actually ran out of copper in its storehouse in Matsapha.

This was copper used to replace stolen copper in various parts of the country.

Eswatini Post and Telecommunications Company Manzini External Copper Network Supervisor Patrick Msibi revealed on Wednesday during the trial of four copper theft suspects who were nabbed after allegedly stealing copper at Mafutseni area and surrounding areas.

The accused persons appeared before Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo. They were slapped with three counts of copper theft amounting to over E100 000.

The four, Nhlanhla Mtshali, Samkeliso Mtshali, Nhlanhla Dlamini and Siyabonga Ndwandwe pleaded guilty to some of the charges and not guilty to some. Elaborating before court about the predicament faced by EPTC Msibi said it was not only the company that suffers losses but the whole nation. He said EPTC suffers losses because copper is bought outside Eswatini.

He said the communication industry gets set back as a result, internet connections are affected whilst most clients rely on the internet for conducting their business.


He said banks, hospitals and a lot of government services get affected.

He said the company is inturn forced to refund clients for lack of service delivery.

Msibi said another thing that must be noted was that the amount to replace stolen copper usually doubles in value because when purchasing copper they also have to hire personnel to work on the site where the copper needs to be replaced and pay for overtime.

Msibi also said that copper theft becomes rife around the month of February and March, the same period the accused allegedly stole the copper cables.

The accused were remanded back into police custody and will appear again in court for trial on 30 November.

Gordhan's leaked submission reveals Zuma's meddling in decision making at SAA

JOHANNESBURG - Former SA before the inquiry next week, but his to default on its debt repayments. The purchase of 10 A320 aircraft would be swapped for the lease of five A330-300s. But Gordhan says Myeni wanted to change the deal to buy the planes instead.

It would have cost the airline around R603 million at the time and cause it

In the same month of his re-appointment, Gordhan says Zuma phoned him asking whether what Myeni wanted was doable.

Gordhan says it was clear Myeni had contacted the former President and he explained to him that the fiscus could not afford the pre-payments.

Eventually, the swap went ahead as approved by Nene.

Gordhan says prior to his appointment, progress in replacing the SAA board had been slow and a compromise was reached for Myeni to serve another year.



HERE'S TO 57 YEARS OF SAFER SKIES

swatini Civil Aviation Authority's Air Traffic Controllers joined the world in celebrating their own professional day on October 20.

The Air Traffic Controllers' Day is an annual event and this year's theme was "PROMOTING SAFETY AND EFFICIENCY IN THE SKIES".

This year Eswatini Civil Aviation Authority Air Traffic Controllers celebrated the day at Open House Boutique in Manzini and was graced by Eswatini Airlink Chief Pilot Mr Robert Dlamini and local Engineer Mr Joseph Dlamini. The main objective of the guests was to promote safety, efficiency and regularity in Eswatini skies.

Celebrating the Air Traffic Controllers' day started when the International Federation of Air Traffic Controllers' Associations (IFATCA) was founded in October 20, 1961. The founder of IFATCA Mr. Jacob Wachtel, proposed that the idea of a world federation of air traffic controllers' associations become visible.

A working group was formed and met in Amsterdam, the Netherlands from 19 to 20

October 1961 to prepare the foundation of the Federation. Soon thereafter, many other national organizations expressed an interest in joining such a federation.

The goals of the Federation are: to promote safety, efficiency, and regularity in international air navigation; to assist and advise in the development of safe and orderly systems of air traffic control and new procedures and facilities; to promote and uphold a high standard of k nowledge and professional efficiency among air traffic controllers.

To achieve this, IFATCA

closely cooperates with national and international aviation authorities, and institutions concerned with air navigation; it sponsors and supports the passage of legislation and regulations which will increase and protect the safety of air navigation.

The Eswatini Civil Aviation Authority's air traffic controllers that have their own association of controllers affiliating to IFATCA known as the Eswatini Air Traffic Controllers' Association (SWATCA).

SWATCA subscribes to IFATCA and follows the mandate set by IFATCA; to promote safety, efficiency and regularity in air navigation among air traffic controllers.

Whilst annually celebrating this day, a good work understanding, expectation and agreement on some of the daily procedures when executing their duties is clarified amongst the air traffic controllers and pilots.

The regulations, which are a common cause for safety, efficiency and expedition are cemented as the main focus of Eswatini aviation, in line with the core requirements of IFATCA.



LIKE MOSES AND HIS SANDALS, REMOVE **CONDOM WHEN COMING TO THE HOLY SH**



THE church has come out guns blazing against the availability of condoms in their premises because these are easily available in other alternative places of gathering such as bars, discotheques, brothels, sports, recreation and health centres.

Bishop Stephen Masilela of the Conference of Churches sounded rather disgusted at the very prospect of even contemplating bringing the contraceptives into the house of worship.

The bringing along of condom discussions have, however, not been extended to synagogues, tindumba and mosques for a more exciting debate.

This debate has taken a completely different tone as compared to the routinely scholastic presentations on whether or not condom use and holiness coexist.

This time it is about bringing condoms to church especially for the many broken pieces of human beings who flock houses of worship for nights on end in the name of 'all-night-prayer', night vigil, crossover, boot camp, where people of both sexes are very likely going to put to the test their ability to withstand the urge to engage in the most fulfilling body exercise, consensual sexual intercourse.

Back in the day it was more an opportunity for courting each time congregants were to cross many rivers for an all-night prayer in some other village where there would be in anticipation very attractive members of the opposite sex at the meeting arena.

Those gatherings by their nature constitute a church in the literal understanding of the setting, that everyone assumes God is there and watching. We all agree that in the church there are more broken pieces of human beings than the belief in the power of Christ that it can heal at the snap of a pastor's pronouncement, 'stand up you have been made pure!'

Process

The process of healing, coupled with the prospects of forgiveness, that is, I may as well do it because certainly I'll be cleansed over and over again are rather soothing.

The temptation for doing it just this only once is there and omnipresent.

It is for this reason that on average we sin every day of our lives, every moment to be precise, because we know we shall return in the privacy of our souls to seek for forgiveness and be forgiven for whatever the degree or number of times that we do what our conscience tells us it's wrong.

How much more, if logic dictates that I may as well carry along my condom in my bag or back pocket just in case an opportunity for a sexual encounter avails itself.

Sexual intercourse in itself is not a readily available commodity, it has some form of scarcity by its own right and when an opportunity avails itself humans naturally grab that opportunity. It is the animal in the human.

Because people are generally morally weak and prone to fall headstrong on seductive gestures it may not be easy to summon the energy of going to the nearest pub or brothel to look for a condom which is often far away from the place of worship, whence if the condom was available in

the church toilet then the function of the very nature and purpose of a condom would be realised.

Precaution or safe sex. It is unreasonable to assume that by going to church and listening to music and sermons from the other side of the pulpit people's behaviours are automatically switched.

Why Give Out Condoms? The United Church of Christ says: Because we believe it sends the right message; Sexuality is a gift from God to be shared with love and responsi-

bility; Loving carefully is a moral responsibility;

We affirm abstinence and acknowledge people do have choices; No matter the age, abstinence is always a viable choice; Safer sexual behaviour is a matter of life and death; When people choose to engage in sex, we affirm safer sexual behaviour.

It adds that the presence of condoms: is an educational tool that evokes questions and encourages discussion; does not "promote" sexual activity; takes sex-

ual behaviour seriously; promotes honesty in sexual relationships; provides opportunities to open conversations that can save lives

Conjugal act

The Catholic Church has clearly taught us this to be [condom use] "intrinsically evil" is a specific kind of human act, defined by Paul VI in his encyclical "Humanae vitae," and later included in No. 2370 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, as an "action which, whether in anticipation of the conjugal act, or in its accomplishment, or in the development of its natural consequences, proposes, whether as an end or as a means, to render procreation impossible. [The Tablet, Martin Rhonheimer, 2004]. A year earlier after protests against the Catholic ban on condoms protesters wrote "Condoms prevent AIDS, Cardinals don't".

Masilela's reaction on national radio on Tuesday

was rather about bringing these safe sex kits into the church where people spend most of their time worshipping.

I know what else takes place in the church or place of worship other than worshiping, such as pimping with pastors encouraging followers to choose spouses from among themselves instead of elsewhere.

They are told to look homeward for their sexual and other appetites.

Before the proliferation of the latter day version of the church there were very strict social values based not only on the Biblical teachings for the Swazi but also on the way of life of the Swazi which had other precautions for unsafe sex such as the use of stuck-on-you magic portion of likhubalolenja whereby the male member would not release itself in the event the man is committing adultery with a married woman.

Precautions have always been there, in the event of danger harm must be minimised.

The traditional African church in Zion sects, be they red, blue, green or white gowns, had always tolerated polygamy before this was demonised by the latter day church with its well

marketed agenda of taking over the world platform as the best replacement of orthodox and other churches in the developing world.

The church elders then, and some up to now, are given the priority to pick first from the congregation before anyone else and it is enshrined in the unwritten constitution of these churches. This is just one among many of the privileges given to elders on a silver platter, including overall dividend of the entire spoils generously dubbed offer-

ings, tithes, contributions.

THE FLU SHOT LOWERS YOUR RISKOFAHEARTATTACK

...Study shows heart issues are more common in people who skip the shot

Were the members of the legendary musical group Bon Jovi medical visionaries? How else do you explain Shot to the Heart? This prophetic song predicted the protective benefits of the flu shot against heart disease more than 30 years before researchers would arrive at the same conclusion.

Earlier in 2018, researchers from the University of Toronto published a ground-breaking study in the New England Journal of Medicine linking heart attacks and influenza. The study by Dr. Jeffrey Kwong and colleagues examined almost 20 000 patients who tested positive for influenza.

They discovered that the risk of a heart attack increases 600 per cent within a week of influenza infection. While the risk increased with other respiratory infections, influenza caused the greatest increase.

As a molecular cardiologist, my research focuses on developing new treatments for heart attacks. The discovery that influenza is such a powerful risk for heart attacks presents researchers and health-care professionals with a new challenge in dealing with patients who have heart disease.


FLU SHOT DECREASES RISK OF HEART ATTACKS

With influenza rearing its ugly head every year, what can be done to protect the heart? It turns out something as simple as the flu vaccine may provide a protective 'shot to the heart.

Investigators from the National Institute of Infectious Diseases and Vaccinology in Taiwan examined the medical records of 80 000 elderly patients over 13 years. This study found that an annual influenza vaccination decreased the risk of a heart attack by 20 per cent and offered similar protection against strokes.

The flu shot doesn't just decrease the risk of heart attacks. It also protects patients who already have heart disease. In a study from The George Institute for Global Health at University of Oxford, the health records of 59 202 heart failure patients were exam-

Researchers found that patients who were vaccinated against influenza were 27 per cent less likely to be hospitalised for heart failure complications.

EVEN THE WRONG STRAIN PROTECTS THE HEART

Unlike most vaccinations that target one type of infection, there are many strains or types of influenza. Each year scientists predict what type will be most common and recommend an annual vaccination against that strain.

The uncertainty about which type

of influenza will dominate means the vaccine is not always highly effective. On average, the effectiveness of the annual influenza vaccine is 50 to 70 per

Interestingly, even when the latest events, influenza vaccinations are it's necessary to not 100 per cent effective against the flu, they still provide protection against history heart disease.

One study shows that patients whose vaccination failed to prevent an influenza-like illness had lower rates of cardiovascular events compared to people who were not vaccinated.

Similarly, a 2017 study by published in the journal Clinical Infectious Diseases reported that even when influenza vaccination fails to prevent the flu, the severity of the infection is less and there are fewer complications.

tions, especially for high-risk groups like seniors, children under five years of age and people with chronic medical conditions like heart dis-

Canada has set a target of 80 per cent influenza vaccination coverage for seniors with chronic medical condi-

tions. According to Statistics Canada, 32 per cent of seniors in this group received a flu shot in 2013-2014.

In Europe, fewer than half of people in high-risk groups receive a flu shot and similarly low rates are reported in the United States and Australia.

Why are influenza vaccination rates so low? The propagation of myths and misconceptions about the risks and benefits of vaccination through social media is a significant driver.

Misinformation about the flu shot is increasingly causing people to question its value. Additionally, people in low-risk groups may decline to get a flu shot because of a sense of invulnerability.

INVEST IN HERD IMMUNITY

While it's true that healthy people are at low risk for complications from influenza, declining vaccination puts others at risk.

Healthy people who are not vaccinated increase the chances of contracting the flu and passing it along to high-risk individuals. Vaccination of healthy, low-risk individuals is crucial to maintaining the health of the general population, a phenomenon called 'herd immunity.'

This flu season, roll up your sleeve and get a flu shot. Do it for your heart. Bon Jovi would tell you that anything else is just Bad Medicine.


Dr. Akinwumi Adesina.

Nigerian billionaire Aliko Dangote also said it was comforting that African leaders have adopted an investment mindset. 
"We should always bear in mind that when you import something, you are importing poverty and creating jobs elsewhere," Dangote warned.

Gross Official Reserves at E7.1bn

THE country's Gross official reserves are now at an improved E7.1 billion after a Sothern African Customs Union (SACU) boost of 9.8 per cent at the end of October.

This is contained in the Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) monthly statistical release for September/October.

The report revealed that Gross Official R e s e r v e s amounted to E7.1 billion at the end of October 2018, 9.8 per cent higher compared to September 2018.

The expansion in reserves
was mainly boosted by the quarterly
inflow of the Southern African
Custom Union (SACU) receipts
at the beginning of October.

According to the report the reserves were enough to cover three months of imports of goods and services, higher than the three months observed in September. When compared over the year, the reserves receded by 16.2 per cent.

The report further revealed that in special drawing rights (SDRs)

the reserves were worth SDR346.5 million at the end of October, registering a rise of 6.5 per cent from the preceding month. Compared year-on-year, the Reserves in SDRs terms receded by 18.9 per cent.

On another note, the report revealed that credit extended to the private sector stood at E14.4 billion at the end of September, 0.3 per cent higher and depicting a recovery

from the fall of 2.3 per cent observed in August 2018.

Perfomance
This performance was evident in credit to households and non-profit making institutions serving households (NPISH)

and credit to businesses which grew by 2.0 per cent and 1.4 per cent respectively. Credit to other sectors of the economy however, slipped by 7.7 per cent. Furthermore, the report revealed that credit extended to businesses closed the review month at E6.7 billion depicting a month-on-month expansion of 1.4 per cent.

This development was on account of growth in credit to distribution and tourism.

13 DIE IN STUDENT MASSARE

...gunman fired at a bar packed with college students in southern California

CALIFORNIA - AT least 13 people died, including a sheriff's sergeant and the gunman, after a shooting inside a bar packed with college students in southern California, the Ventura County sheriff's office said.

Ventura County Sheriff Geoff Deansaid yesterday sheriff's sergeant Ron Helus responded to the scene and was shot after he entered the building in Thousand Oaks. He died at a hospital early yesterday.

Authorities did not say how the gunman died.

Dean said around 10 other people were shot and wounded. No other information on the victims was immediately known.

Ventura County Sheriff's Office Captain Garo Kuredjian said the first reports of shots fired came around 11:20pm at the Borderline Bar & Grill in Thousand Oaks, which is about 50km west of Los Angeles.

The bar's website says its hosts "College Country Night" every Wednesday. Police said hundreds were inside when the shooting occurred.

Al Jazeera's Rob Reynolds, reporting from Washington, DC, said the bar was packed with college students before the gunman forced his way in

"The gunman used an automatic weapon and also threw in some sort of smoke bombs into the crowd in the club," he said.

Police had told the Los Angeles

Times that at least 30 shots were fired at the Borderline Bar & Grill in Thousand Oaks.

An unnamed source told reporters that a victim managed to escape through the window of the bar.

"He told us how he broke a cou-

ple of windows and him and his friends helped push women out to save them first.

His hand was cut up and he has blood on his face. His friend was shot in the shoulder," the witness The extent of the victims' injuries has not yet been released. Law enforcement and emergency crews were flooding the scene.

Authorities urged the public to avoid the area.

Boeing plane crashed after key sensor replaced

INDONESIA - A crucial sensor was replaced on a Lion Air jet the day before it plunged into the Java Sea, and that sensor replacement may have exacerbated other problems with the plane, Indonesian investigators said yesterday.

That sensor, known as the "angle of attack" sensor, keeps track of the angle of the aircraft nose to help prevent the plane from stalling and diving

Earlier this week, Indonesian officials hinted that airspeed indicators played a role in the deadly October 29 crash that killed all 189 people on board.

The jet's airspeed indicator malfunctioned on its last four flights, and that problem was related to the sensor issue, said Soerjanto Tjahjono, Chairperson of Indonesia's National Transportation Safety Committee, yesterdau

Russia, US postpone summit at French request

PARIS - The Kremlin said Wednesday that Russia and the United States have agreed not to hold a summit in Paris to avoid diverting attention from weekend commemorations marking the 100th anniversary of World War I's end.

Russian President Vladimir Putin and US President Donald Trump expect to see each other briefly but won't have a full-scale meeting during the centenary Armistice Day events, Kremlin foreign affairs adviser Yuri Ushakov said.

Ushakov said France conveyed concern that a Putin-Trump summit would steal the limelight from the Paris observances. Officials from the US and Russia decided to delay the meeting until the end of the month, when both leaders expect to attend a Group of 20 summit in Argentina.

Trump said on Monday he "probably" would not be meeting with

Putin in Paris, but will meet with him during the G-20.

When US National Security Adviser John Bolton visited Moscow last month, he and Russian officials also talked about the presidents visiting each other's countries, according to Ushakov.

"A possible exchange of visits to Moscow and Washington was discussed, but there was no specific talk about the issue yet," he added.

White House suspends CNN journo Jim Acosta's access

WASHINGTON - The White House suspended the press credentials of CNN reporter Jim Acosta yesterday, hours after Acosta tangled with President Donald Trump during a televised news conference.

The move to punish Acosta by removing his access to the White House is believed to be unprecedented. The Trump administration barred another CNN reporter from attending an open media

event in July but until now has not gone as far as removing a credential, known as a "hard pass," which enables journalists to enter the White House grounds.

Confrontation

Press Secretary Sarah Sanders cited Acosta's brief confrontation with a White House press aide during Trump's news conference as the reason for suspending his press pass "until further notice."

During the 90-minute news con-

ference, Trump snapped at Acosta after he asked why the president had called the Central American migrant caravan "an invasion" and "demonised immigrants."

Following a lengthy and tense verbal back-and-forth, in which Trump at one point started to stray from his lectern and he called Acosta "a rude, terrible person," a female White House intern tried to take the microphone from Acosta.

The class of 2019 includes the youngest congressional women in history, 29-year-olds Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez from New York and Abby Finkenauer from Iowa, as well as the first two Native American women, and the first two Muslim women, Palestinian-American Rashida Tlaib and Somali-American Ilhan Omar.

Young boy missing after family attack

CANBERRA - A search is underway for a 12-year-old boy after a young family was found dead near their broken-down vehicle in the remote Australian outback, police said yesterday. The bodies of two adults, both 19, and their three-year-

old son were found late on Wednesday on a remote road near Willowra, about 300 kilometres north of Alice Springs in the Northe

of Alice Springs in
the Northern
Territory. An extensive land and air search is
now underway for a 12-year-old who is believed
to have been a passenger in the vehicle, after
police received information from other family
members. Police could not say whether the
boy was related to the dead family.

11 children among 21 migrants smuggled

LONDON - Eleven children as young as 12 were among a group of 21 Vietnamese migrants found hiding in a refrigerated truck at a busy port. The stowaways, concealed behind stacks of sparkling water, were discovered when the vehicle was checked by Border Force officers in Sussex. A total of 17 people initially claimed to be aged 17 or under when the truck arrived at the Port of Newhaven after crossing from Dieppe in France – but only 11 of them were confirmed as minors.

Yemen forces edge closer to lifeline port

YEMEN - In the past 24 hours fighting claimed the lives of 27 rebels and 12 pro-government fighters on the outskirts of Hodeida city.

Yemeni pro-government forces advanced closer to rebel-held Hodeida overnight, a military source said on Wednesday, raising fears over humanitarian aid deliveries through the lifeline port city.

Concern was also growing for civilians in Hodeida, as the fighting drew near and after reports that snipers had positioned themselves on a hospital rooftop.

While BusinessLive has reported that the sworn affidavit submitted by Gordhan proves he has "nothing to hide", the EFF

have released a statement in which they vehemently disagree.

The strongly worded statement calls Gordhan a "master manipulator" who was an "accomplice to the Guptas' activities". The EFF claim that Tiso Blackstar, the media conglomerate BusinessLive is owned by, are Gordhan's "propagandists", who are seeking to drive a narrative absolving Gordhan of what they claim is his complicity in state capture.


According to the party, "virtually everyone who served in strategic positions in Zuma's Cabinet since 2009 were in the pockets and under the micromanagement of the Guptas, and this includes Pravin Gordhan". The statement then goes on to list some of the many other kinds of misconduct the party accuses Gordhan of, all of which have been mentioned before. The party's

war against Gordhan has been intensifying throughout the year, with the party having

been accused of descending into all-out conspiracy theories in their accusations against the minister.

These have included, recently, EFF leader Julius Malema's assertion, at a press conference held to address the party's alleged role in the VBS bank scandal, that the party was implicated in the debacle in an alleged witch-hunt executed by Gordhan alongside Treasury.

The party believes this is as a result of their role in pushing for the removal of former finance minister Nhlanhla Nene. "We know that

Pravin Gordhan and his faction are angry about [the removal of Nene] and they've launched a media attack on the EFF to try and shut us up," he alleged. EFF Deputy President Floyd Shivambu levelled a series of damning accusations against Gordhan in a paranoid, rambling blog post, including that he is running a "cabal" and "operating a parallel state apparatus". And just yesterday, EFF spokesperson Dr Mbuyiseni Ndlozi, speaking at the standing committee on finance about

the VBS scandal, asked the author of the VBS Mutual Bank report, advocate Terry Motau, questions that appeared to reinforce the party's belief that Gordhan was involved in smearing them through the VBS scandal. "Did you meet any individuals to discuss the report before its release? For example, Mr Pravin Gordhan, did you meet him to discuss the report or anyone on the Treasury? If you did, what was the basis and what were the discussions?" he asked Motau. Citizen

Steenhuisen, Malema refuse to withdraw insults

Parliament - Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) leader Julius Malema and Democratic Alliance (DA) chief whip John Steenhuisen were ordered out of the National Assembly on Wednesday after both refused to withdraw insults they hurled at each other on Tuesday.

House chairwoman Thoko Didiza told Steenhuisen to retract the words "VBS bank looters" which he directed at Malema and his deputy, Floyd Shivambu, in reference to allegations that they shared in the spoils of the scam that robbed the bank of nearly R2 billion.

Steenhuisen said he would not because her ruling was inconsistent with previous rulings by other presiding officers.

Didiza told him to leave the chamber, then proceeded to rule that Malema had broken the rules with a racist slur by calling Steenhuisen a "white boy". She also ruled out of order his further remark that Steenhuisen accused of rape.

Malema responded by reiterating his first remark and was told to eve. ANA

I met with the Guptas, says Gordhan in leaked statement

JOHANNESBURG - The minister is angry that his statement detailing his dealings with the Guptas has been leaked.

In a sworn affidavit, ahead of his testimony at the commission of inquiry into state capture, Minister of Public Enterprises Pravin Gordhan details an official meeting with the Guptas, as well as other encoun-

According to Gordhan, he met the Guptas at the request of then president Jacob Zuma at some stage during his first term.

He says he refused to meet with them after that, but admits to see-

ing them at two events and at a busines meeting after this.

The minister is apparently angry that the statement he submitted to Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo's inquiry has been leaked and has not remained confidential, News24 has reported.

At Gordhan's first Gupta meeting, Jacob Zuma introduced Ajay Gupta to him as "my friend".

Zuma told Gordhan, who was finance minister at the time, that Gupta was a business and finance expert.

"I recall us exchanging generalities for a couple of minutes, but I do not recall the details of what was

a very cursory exchange. Mr Gupta then excused himself and left me and the former president to continue our meeting," Gordhan says. Later, in 2010, Tony Gupta called a meeting between Gordhan and an Indian businessman who wanted to aquire a stake in MTN. Gordhan says the Gupta brother "badgered" Gordhan's chief of staff at the time, Dondo Mogajane, to accept the meeting on behalf of Gordhan.

Gordhan says he agreed to attending because the businessman could have been potentially a major investor, but he does not remember the meeting in detail. Citizen

'We need to know where political parties are getting money from'

JOHANNESBURG - Former public protector Thuli Madonsela has urged President Cyril Ramaphosa to sign the Political Party Funding Bill into law as a "major priority" so voters can know where parties get their money before the crucial 2019 general election.

"Especially in the run-up to the elections, we need to know who is giving money to who," Madonsela told Business Day on Wednesday.

"For me it's all about capture. It's

about who is giving money to who and... if [the] government is suddenly pandering to the interests of those that have paid large sums of money, then as citizens we need to start knowing about it."

Madonsela says the Bill, sitting on Ramaphosa's desk since it was passed by Parliament in March, is "extremely important" in ensuring the rights of voters and enabling greater accountability and integrity among political parties. ANA

De Lille lays fraud charges against DA

CAPE TOWN - Former Cape Town mayor Patricia de Lille has laid charges against senior members of the Democratic Alliance for "defaming and forged" posts on social media.

The former DA member has laid fraud charges against DA members who she says distributed forged statements to discredit her. De Lille said the posts were distributed on social media suggesting that they were from the auditor general of South Africa.

She said her unemployed status allowed her to reflect and attend to important matters "such this one" of "false" allegations by the DA.

"I am taking this action because of the serious nature of the fraud as well as the total disregard and disrespect shown to the office of the Auditor General by public representatives."

"I am also doing this because I value the rights and protection that our Constitution should afford our society and citizens, because I love my country and because I want to ensure that all citizens are treated equally and protected by the laws that we fought so hard for." News24

Nzimande was responding to questions in National Assembly about contradictory messages coming from government, with Finance Minister Tito Mboweni in his medium-term budget policy statement indicating the user pay principles would remain in place and Gauteng Premier David Makhura insisting government should scrap e-tolls. Nzimande said while government was looking at alternatives to e-tolls, the current situation in which the SA National Roads Agency Limited (SANRAL) had incurred massive debts to build highways, meant road users had to pay for using freeways.

GADDAFI'S ASYLUM SEEKER 'SON' LANGUISHES IN ZIM JAIL SINCE 2014

HARARE - A man claiming to be slain Libyan leader Muammar Gaddafi's son has been languishing at Harare Remand Prison since 2014 when he came to the country as an asylum seeker, NewZimbabwe.com has established.

The man says he came to Zimbabwe to seek political asylum and expected to be put in a refugee camp, but local authorities detained him at the Harare prison instead.

He has remained there since; without any trial and or charges being levelled against him.

Abdailha Moussa Mone Yousof Mouammare Al Gaddafi, 32, who claims to be the late Libyan leader's adopted son, is now challenging his continued detention through the courts.

Taking up the case is Harare lawyer Charles Warara who famously led the private prosecution and conviction for rape of former Zanu PF legislator and one-time top RBZ executive Munyaradzi Kereke.

Preparations

In an interview with NewZimbabwe.com this Wednesday, Warara said he was asked to take the case up by High Court.

"Instructions came to me through the Criminal Registry office in the High Court for his representation," said Warara.

"What I basically found out was that there is a person who says he is an adopted son of the late Muammar Gaddafi and he confirmed to me that it is a fact he is the adopted son of the late president."

Libya has been ravaged by civil war since strongman Gaddaffi was toppled and assassinated in 2011.

Gaddaffi was close to former Zimbabwean president Robert Mugabe, and it was that connection which resulted in the son seeking protection through political asylum in Harare.

"He said he came to Zimbabwe to seek asylum since his father had a relationship with former president Robert Mugabe," explained

"(However) things did not go according to plans after he allegedly went to a Mosque in Harare and some unknown people took his documents and belongings including some cash."

Warara continued; "As it stands, I am trying to establish what transpired with officials in government. The man has no documentation at all.

"We do not know what the officials are saying as yet because I have not approached them.

"We want to know if his detention has anything to do with any crime. No one knows why prison officials have kept him for so long either.

Truth

"At one point he was once deported to Ethiopia in 2015, but he was brought back by Ethiopian Airlines as Addis Ababa would not take him." In papers before the courts, the Libyan said his continued detention was now "amounting to a sentence served without an offence committed" and urged the court to order his "imme-

diate release unconditionally".

Warara vowed to unravel the truth behind the Libyan's plight. He explained; "I will do investigations on who did what and why between

the government departments?

"These include the immigration department, home affairs ministry (police) and the prosecutor general's office to establish what exactly in learning him inside

ly is keeping him inside.

"Basically, it is about his human rights; whether they have been violated; if so, how can we get redress."

Dissident must get 22-year sentence

RWANDA - Prosecutors on Wednesday requested that Rwanda's leading dissident politician be handed 22 years in prison for inciting insurrection and forgery as her trial opened in the capital Kigali.

"We request that Diane Rwigara be imprisoned for 15 years for inciting insurrection and seven years for forging documents," prosecutors told the single-day hearing at Kigali's High Court. But a treason charge, which had previously been laid against Rwigara, was not mentioned in court. Rwigara, 37, denies the charges, dismissing them as 'politically motivated' after her blocked attempt to challenge President Paul Kagame in last year's elections.

Mauritania buses collide killing 11

MAURITANIA - At least 11 people were killed and 44 injured on Wednesday when two buses collided on a road between Mauritania's capital Nouakchott and the central city of Aleg, doctors and police said. Five passengers died in the crash and six more on their way to hospital in Aleg, a doctor said. The 11 comprised six Mauritanians, two Ivorians, two Togolese and an 11th individual who has not been identified. One of the buses had come from the Malian capital Bamako, and most of its passengers were Malians and Guineans as well as Mauritanians returning home, a security source said.

NIGERIA- Gunmen have abducted four Catholic priests in southern Nigeria, a local state official told AFP. The kidnapping happened on Tuesday at a border community between Edo and Delta States in the south, said Andrew Aniamaka, a spokesperson for Delta State. "They were abducted on their way to Ekpoma, Edo state, from Delta for an event," he added, saying police and local security were hunting for the gunmen. AFP

NEARLY 50 DEAD AS BUSES COLLIDE IN ZIMBABWE

HARARE - Road accidents are common in the country, where roads are riddled with potholes due to years of underfunding and neglect.

Forty-seven people were killed in Zimbabwe Wednesday when two buses collided on a road between the capital Harare and the eastern town of Rusape, police told AFP.

"We confirm 47 people have died in a road traffic accident at the 166kilometre peg along the Harare-Mutare highway," police spokesman Paul Nyathi said.

On Twitter, the state-run Herald newspaper said pictures from the scene were too graphic to post.

The paper said the morgue at the local public hospital in Rusape had run out of space and sought help

from a private funeral parlour to take in some of the corpses.

Traffic accidents are common in Zimbabwe, where roads are riddled with potholes due to years of underfunding and neglect, but the highway where the accident occurred had been recently resurfaced.

In June last year, 43 people were killed in a bus crash in the north of the country, along the highway leading to neighbouring Zambia.

Deputy Transport Minister Fortune Chasi said the government will take steps to curb the road carnage.

"Totally needless loss of lives. This event should be the last before stern measures are taken," he tweeted, promising to rein in public service vehicles and their owners.

Mugabe ministers in court on graft charges in Zimbabwe

HARARE - Two former ministers under Robert Mugabe appeared in court in Harare on Wednesday on corruption charges, nearly a year after Zimbabwe's long-time ruler was ousted from power.

Mugabe's successor President Emmerson Mnangagwa has vowed to crack down on corruption, though critics say his government is still mired in the corruption that marred the Mugabe era.

Former information, communication and technology minister Supa Mandiwanzira faces two graft

charges involving \$5m.

Harare's chief provincial magistrate granted him bail of \$2 000 and set his trial date for December 10.

In a separate room of the same court complex, the trial of Saviour Kasukuwere, a former local government, youth and environment minister and a senior figure in the ruling Zanu-PF party, also got under way on Wednesday.

Kasukuwere who is facing charges of illegally parcelling out land worth \$2m to former first lady Grace Mugabe's sister, pleaded not guilty.

Also Wednesday, Mugabe's sonin-law Simba Chikore appeared in the same court for a routine remand hearing on kidnapping charges over the alleged detention of an airline official.

Magistrate Elisha Singano said Chikore would stand trial on December 14.

Since Mugabe's ousting after a brief military takeover in November 2017, authorities have arrested several of his allies including former home affairs minister Ignatius Chombo and former energy minister Samuel Undenge. *ANA*

In Gabon, questions surge over absent president

GABON - Political speculation and concerns for the economy have gone into overdrive in Gabon as questions grow over the fate of President Ali Bongo who was hospitalised in Saudi Arabia two weeks ago.

According to a non-Gabonese source close to Bongo, the president 'suffered a stroke.'

"It's no longer life-threatening, and he is no longer under artificial respiration," the source said, speaking on condition of anonymity, adding that Bongo was still in Riyadh.

An AFP journalist who went to Riyadh's King Faisal Hospital where Bongo was admitted, was on Wednesday told that all information on the president's health was subject to either a 'royal order' or authorisation from the Gabonese embassy. Bongo, 59, fell ill on October 24

Bongo, 59, fell ill on October 24 during a visit to Riyadh to attend an economic forum.

His spokesperson like Ngouoni said doctors there had diagnosed him with 'severe fatigue' and ordered bed rest.

Since then, there has been no official news, and details that are circulating are either sketchy or unverified. This vacuum - along with memories of the secrecy-shrouded demise of Bongo's father, Omar Bongo, who died in office in 2009 after decades at the helm - has set the rumour mill churning at full tilt. *AFP*

SA journalists freed in Tanzania, minus their passports

TANZANIA - The former Mail & Guardian editor suffered a traumatic night after being detained for reasons yet unknown.

South African journalist and editor Angela Quintal – now Africa Programme Coordinator at the Committee to Protect Journalists (CPJ) – and her colleague Muthoki Mumo, the sub-Saharan Africa representative for CPJ Africa, have been released in Tanzania following a 'high-level intervention' by the department of international relations and cooperation (Dirco).

Dirco spokesperson Ndivhuwo Mabaya said the two were in high spirits but it was a a serious issue and they were still without their passports.

This was confirmed by a family spokesperson.

"Officers who identified themselves as working with the Tanzanian







Frosler frozen out by Wits over contract dispute

JOHANNESBURG - Defender Reeve Frosler is being frozen out of the Bidvest Wits squad due to a contract dispute and refusing to undergo a trial at a Portuguese Primeira Liga club.

DECISION MADE IN TERMS OF SECTION9 OF THE ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS ACT,2013 AND SECTION 11 OF THE ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS (LICENSING) REGULATIONS, 2016,ON THE APPLICATION BY SWAZI MTN LIMITED FOR THE RENEWAL OF ITS ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE AND ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK LICENCES RESPECTIVELY

1. EXECUTIVE SUMMAR

- Noting the expiration of the MTN Swaziland Limited (here in after referred to as "Swazi MTN") license on 18 November 2018, and further to Swazi MTN's submission of an application for renewal on4 of August 2018, and a compliance evaluation process described in section 4 of this Decision, the Commission has decided as follows:
- 1.1.1 Swazi MTN's Individual Electronic Communications Service ("ECS") license (IECS/002/16/MTN) should be renewed for a period of 10 years (17 November 2018-16 November 2028) in a c c o r d a n c e with the Electronic Communications (Licensing) Regulations, 2016, (Licensing Regulations hereinafter). The terms and conditions of the licence will be in accordance with the prevailing licensing framework, as may be amended from time to time.
- 1.1.2 Swazi MTN's Individual Electronic Communications Network ("ECN") license (IENS/002/16/MTN) should be renewed for a period of 10 years (17 November 2018-16 November 2028) in accordance with the Licensing Regulations. The terms and conditions of the licence will be in accordance with the prevailing licensing framework, as may be amended from time to time.
- 1.1.3 Additional new Terms and Conditions shall be included in the new licenses to address any non-compliance issues identified during the evaluation process.
- 1.1.4 Swazi MTN be granted the new licence upon the payment of licence fees to be determined by the Commission.

2. LEGAL AND REGULATORY BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Swazi MTN was initially licensed on 18 November 2008 to provide mobile telephony networks and services in the Kingdom of Eswatini. On 28 November 2016, the Eswatini Communications Commission ("ESCCOM" or "The Commission") converted the Swazi MTN licence to align it with the new legal and regulatory regime. In so doing the Commission issued an Electronic Communication Service Licence (ECS Licence) and an Electronic Communications Network Licence (ECN Licence) to Swazi MTN.
- 2.2 It is important to note that:
- 2.2.1 Swazi MTN's" ECS" and "ECN"licenses ("the licenses") were issued in accordance with Section 50 of Electronic Communications Act, no. 9 of 2013 (hereinafter referred to as the Act). Jointly, the licences allow Swazi MTN to own and operate electronic communications networks and services in the Kingdom on a converged and technology neutral basis.
- 2.2.2 Swazi MTN's licences were valid for the remainder of the validity period of the existing licence issued in 2008. Thus, the licenses are valid from 18 November 2008 to 17 November 2018. In terms of clause 3.3 of the current licence, Swazi MTN shall apply for the renewal of its licence to the Commission, no earlier than twelve (12) months and no later than six (6) months prior to the expiry of the licence.
- The "ECN"Licence allows Swazi MTN to establish, operate and maintain an electronic communications network; interconnect its network with and lease facilities from any duly licensed Electronic Communications Network licensee within the Kingdom of Eswatini; and provide Electronic Communications Network services and lease facilities to any duly licensed operator providing Electronic Communications Services and Broadcasting Services within the Kingdom of Eswatini.
- The "ECS" Licence permits Swazi MTN to provide, inter alia, the following electronic communications services on a technology-neutral basis: public voice telephony, data and value-added services; and to lease transmission capacity directly from an "I-ECN" Licensee/ and/or another licensee (as set forth in the Regulations) in order to provide public or private telecommunications services, whether on an international or national basis, to end users and/or another licensee.

3. CONTEXT OF LICENCE RENEWAL APPLICATION

- 3.1 Swazi MTN applied for the renewal of its ECS and ECN licences in terms of clause 3.3 of the licences on 4 August 2017, which signaled the commencement of the licence renewal process. As a result, the Commission embarked on a process to evaluate Swazi MTN's compliance with the prevailing legislation, licence conditions, regulations, decisions, guidelines, determinations and authorizations issued by the Commission in order to assess
 - (1) whether the licences should be renewed;
 - (2) if so, on what terms they should be renewed; and
 - (3) whether any sanctions should be issued in the event of non-compliance.
- 3.2 The Commission advised Swazi MTN of the process to be followed and requested the company to submit information to be considered in terms of the license renewal process based on its license obligations and regulatory requirements. Swazi MTN duly submitted the said information to the Commission which then undertook the evaluation exercise and made the findings set out in section 5 of this Decision.

4. SUMMARY OF ANALYSIS AND FINDINGS

- 4.1 The evaluation process undertaken by the Commission found that Swazi MTN has complied broadly with the obligations as set out in the previous and current licenses, legislative and regulatory instruments. The process revealed that Swazi MTN has complied with the following obligations as set out in the previous and current licences, legislative and regulatory instruments:
- 4.1.1 All services provided by Swazi MTN are provided in manner that is compliant with the scope of the licence, all legislative instruments, regulations, decisions, guidelines, determinations and authorizations issued by the Commission;
- 4.1.2 Ensuring that all tariffs and charges for electronic communication services offered by Swazi MTN are approved by the Commission prior to the rollout of such services;
- 4.1.3 Ensuring that customers are accurately billed for services consumed;
- 4.1.4Submission of quarterly and annual reports, as well as information required by the Commission from time to time, in a format specified by the Commission, including financial performance, network quality of service, and numbering, amongst others;
- 4.1.5 Ensuring compliance with payment of all requisite fees and Contribution into the Universal Service Fund;
- 4.1.6 Ensuring skills development;
- 4.1.7 Ensuring that all electronic communications equipment used by Swazi MTN is certified for use in the country.

5. FINAL DECISION

- 5.1 In light of the above analysis and findings, the Commission has decided that:
- 5.1.1 Swazi MTN's Individual "ECS" license be and is hereby renewed for a period of 10 years (17 November 2018 to 16 November 2028) in accordance with the Licensing Regulations. The terms and conditions of the licence will be in accordance with the prevailing licensing framework, as may be amended from time to time.
- 5.1.2 Swazi MTN's Individual "ECNS" license be and is hereby renewed for a period of 10 years (17 November 2018 to 16 November 2028) in accordance with the Licensing Regulations. The terms and conditions of the licence will be in accordance with the prevailing licensing framework, as may be amended from time to time.
- 5.1.3 Additional new Terms and Conditions shall be included in the new licenses to address any non-compliance issues identified during the evaluation process.
- 5.1.4The new licences be issued to Swazi MTN upon the payment of licence fees levied in terms of section 14 of the Electronic Communication (Licensing) Regulations, 2016, for the evaluation and renewal of the licence.
- 5.1.5 In line with Section 37 (3) of the Eswatini Communications Act, 2013, the Commission hereby determines the effective date for the decision to be 16 November 20 18.

TURIN - This was the Italian Job, sparked by the man who was handed Mission Impossible.

Manchester United's footballing heist stunned the Allianz Stadium on Wednesday night, but in a living room on the outskirts of Preston, one of the club's former manager may have allowed himself a wry smile.

David Moyes, not Louis van Gaal or Jose Mourinho, was the man responsible for bringing the two men who turned it around to the club, the men who allowed the Portuguese to cup a hand behind his ear. Maybe Moyes, handed the poison chalice following the departure of Sir Alex Ferguson, felt like doing likewise.

The impact of Juan Mata's free-kick, and Marouane Fellaini's wrecking ball impression for the winner, cannot be underestimated. United will now head into this weekend's derby with a spring in their step. Mourinho brought both players off the bench with United a goal down and it will be viewed as a masterstroke. A reminder that aside from the whinging and skulduggery, this is a manager who still knows how to win the big games.

The heroes, however, were almost as unlikely as the comeback itself. There was a time when United fans dreaded seeing Fellaini being readied to come on. When social media fan boys would tweet simply: 'Fellaini is warming up', knowing full well the reaction it would prompt from fellow warriors of the keyboard variety.

That dread is now reserved for the opposition. How must they feel when the aggro afro emerges from the bench? Here comes trouble (and elbows).

Fellaini is not your average footballer. He is a throwback to a time when launching it forward was tiki taka. The chaos he creates, while old fashioned, is new to many of today's defenders who simply cannot deal with it - even Juventus's wily, brilliant duo of Leonardo Bonucci and Giorgio Chiellini, with 65 years between them.







released due to a 'special situation', the Confederation of African Football (CAF) said Sunday.

It is believed the 'situation' concerns Moroccan clubs in the CAF Confederation Cup, the second-tier competition below the more lucrative and prestigious CAF Champions League. Hassania Agadir, by finishing third in the league, and Throne (FA) Cup winners Renaissance Berkane or Wydad Fes have qualified for the 2019 Confederation Cup. But if Raja Casablanca win the two-leg 2018 Confederation Cup final against V Club of the Democratic Republic of Congo they will also be entitled to a place.

CAF does not permit three clubs from one country in the competition and, ordinarily, Hassania would drop out to make way for Raja, according to the regulations.

But the 2019 qualifiers involving Hassania and Berkane or Fes begin in November between the first and second legs of the 2018 final, leaving the organisers with a headache.

A CAF statement said the matter would be referred to the emergency committee of the African body for a decision. This is the last year the Champions League and Confederation Cup will be staged from February to November as they switch to August-to-May seasons from next year. The transitional 2019 competitions begin on November 27 and end by June 1 next year.

The gaffer said they needed to work on their finishing going forward.



WOMEN LEAGUE REVIVAL SAVES EFA E7.1M

SOCCER – THE revival of the country's Women National League will ensure the Eswatini Football Association (EFA) pockets US\$500 000 (about E7.15m) from FIFA.


This is according to regulations adopted in the FIFA Forward Plan 2.0 during the eighth meeting of the FIFA Council held in Kigali, Rwanda last week. Moments after the Kigali declaration, the country's Women League finally got underway last week after close to a year of non-action amid infighting within the Women Football Association (WFA) and its affiliates.

The internal strife brewed following the association's elective general assembly wherein some affiliates alleged the constitution was violated hence the Sonnyboy Mabuza-led executive was in office illegally in a matter that even reached the highest court of the land. FIFA announced a whopping US\$6 million (about E85. 8m) for each of its 211 member associations to be spread equally over a four-year period from next year 2019 to 2022.

Conditions

The figure shows a significant US\$1 million (about E14.3 million) increase from development funding of the previous cycle. This means that EFA will get E21.45 million per year under this programme from FIFA. However with conditions attached to maximum funding, EFA stood to lose E7.15 million had the Women League been continually overlooked. The FIFA statement on the programme highlighted that up to US\$1 million (about E14.3m) per year was for operational or running costs, of which US\$500 000 (E7.15m) is subject to the fulfillment of ten specific activities, including organising men's, women's and youth competitions, having active men's and women's national teams, running men's and women's refereeing programmes among other things.

Up to US\$2 million (E28.6m) over the fouryear cycle is for specific projects based on the contract of agreed objectives, with a strong focus on those related to football infrastructure.
