

CANGO praises King for appointing women

THE Coordinating Assembly for **Non-Governmental Organisations** (CANGO) has praised His Majesty King Mswati III for appointing more women into Parliament.

CANGO Communications Officer Nkosingiphile Myeni said the act by the King was a step in the right direction in ensuring that the legislature was adequately represented by women.

Myeni said they still have hope that more women will be appointed to the August House.

Myeni said he was hopeful that the MPs would continue to elect the four women from the four regions of the country, as it looked like that was necessary.

He said the number of women needed in Parliament was big and it needed commitment from all those who were supposed to elect them into the legislature.

The CANGO spokesperson hoped that the already elected and appointed women MPs would continue to make their presence felt in the August House and formulate policies that would help the country turn the economy around.

Hope

He wished the new MPs all the best and hoped that they would work well together.

Currently, 26 women are needed to make up for the 30 per cent women representation in Parliament.

This is required by Section 86 of the Constitution. However, the electorate failed to make this happen when they were given a chance to elect 59 MPs. Out of the 59 MPs, only two women were elected from the constituencies.

The MPs will today be educated on how to add other women amongst the seven that are already MPs.

They are supposed to be taught how to elect the four women from each

They will also be taught how to elect 10 senators, half of whom shall be females.

The training is supposed to start today at 9am at Royal Swazi Convention Centre in Ezulwini.

Ludzeludze MP-elect Vusi Swali is of the view that it would not be wise to elect a person from outside because that person would need to be paid. He said it would be cost-effective to elect a person from within the 69 MPs because they equally qualify to hold

Appointed MP Princess Phumelele initially wished not to comment on the matter. However, she stated that it would not be much of a problem to elect a person from outside to be Speaker.

She said under the economic situation, Tinkhundla were added from 55 to 59 and that changed the budget of the country. She said much of the knowledge about all this would be given to them today during the workshop on how to elect the Speaker.

The Constitution does allow MPs to choose a Speaker from outside Parliament. Section 102 (1) says: "When the House of Assembly first meets after any general election and before it proceeds to the despatch of any other business, it shall elect a person from within or outside the House to be the Speaker of the House of Assembly, in accordance with the Standing Orders.'

In 2008, Prince Guduza was elected from outside Parliament to become Speaker of the House of Assembly.

One baby boy, two fathers?

TWO men are allegedly on each other's throats over the paternity of an eight-month old infant

One of the men is said to have taken the matter to the police to mediate as each of them believes they are the biological father of the infant. The mother Lungile Simelane (23) of Matsetsa is said to have reported the pregnancy first to Ndumiso Mamba of Malindza when she was just couple of weeks pregnant. The pair is said to have been together for almost a year when Simelane conceived.

According to Mamba, he knew that he had made Simelane pregnant just two weeks later. He believes when you are a real man there are signs that show when you have made a woman pregnant. "I instantly reported to my family about the matter and she (Simelane) visited my home to formally report the pregnancy before the family," Mamba said. He said after the reporting pregnancy, he and Simelane began buying baby clothes which he said cost E3 500. Mamba said due to the scarcity of job opportunities, he would at times travel to neighbouring countries and search for temporary jobs for months. He said that gave Simelane the chance to report the pregnancy to a different man which Mamba labelled as 'loaded,' which refers to well-off.

"When the child was born I was away job-hunting in Durban and when I came back I tried contacting her but she ignored my calls," he said. Months quickly went by; Mamba then visited his lover's home at Matsetsa to check on her and their newly born child. He said when he arrived he was firstly surprised by the rude and unwelcoming manner he was accorded.

"They told me that I am not welcome at their home because I almost destroyed their daughter's future. They blatantly told me that Lungile lived with the father of her child in one fancy flat in Manzini," he said. The possible father said he felt so betrayed by Lungile because he was certain that the child was his.

Moreover, Mamba said he decided to report the matter to the police. He said he feared that he would harm Simelane if he pursued the matter on his own because he felt so let down because of poverty.

"I being needy does not give her the right to take my child away from me. Every child deserves to be with their parent and to be recognised by their rightful surname," Mamba

He said the police advised them to perform a DNA test to prove who the father was Mamba highlighted that a DNA test was costly and would take him a while to come up with the said E4 200.

86 people murdered between Jan-Sept

APART from the three that were murdered over the past week, 86 people have been murdered between January and September.

According to statistics obtained from the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS), the rate of mur2018 compared to last year.

By this time last year, 83 lives had been lost through murder.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati, said they are noting the rise of murder cases with great concern.

She said some of these murders were caused by disagreements

ders increased by four per cent in between related persons or intimate partners.

Vilakati pleaded with those who are hurt not to resort to violence but rather make use of available structures that deal with such matters which are the police, churches, non-governmental organisations (NGOs), psycho-therapists and government hospitals.

"Communication is a therapy on

its own. Your problems and your anger are nothing new in the world," Vilakati said. Meanwhile, the International Mental Health Resource Services' (IMERSE) Programme Director Dumsani Njobo Mamba says 10 per cent of some murders have direct association with mental illness.


He said there is a link between anything that happens in life and mental health.

"Understanding the link between

the two requires consideration of other variables such as substance abuse, environmental stressors, anger management and history of violence. All of these are factors that impact on one's mental wellbeing and wellness," Mamba said.

He said direct association between mental illness with murder and any violent act for that matter have escalated the stigmatisation of people living with mental health disorders and mental health in its entity.

SIPHO SHONGWE LOSES TRADITION APPLICATION

MURDER suspect Sipho Shongwe's bid to stop the court from continuing with the case that will see him being extradited back into South Africa has been dismissed by Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo.

The principal magistrate informed Shongwe yesterday during his court appearance that the court has a duty to deal with the matter without any undue delay.

Shongwe had applied to court to have the case that could see him extradited back to the Republic of South Africa dismissed on certain grounds.

South Africa filed a request to have Shongwe extradited to the neighbouring country where he will face a number of charges, including the alleged contravention of Section 117 of the Correctional Service Act No. 111 of 1998, which is escaping and absconding from custody and another charge of forgery and uttering.

Magistrate Khumalo, who is handling the extradition case, made it clear that the court would continue dealing with the extradition process as opposed to dismissing

Khumalo said it would be dangerous for the Eswatini court to place itself at the mercy of the Mpumalanga High Court where the validity of the warrants of Shongwe's arrest leading to the extradition case is being challenged.

Shongwe was opposing his extra-

first being that there is no registered case against him back in South Africa, the validity of his warrant of arrest which is still being challenged at the Mpumalanga High Court and lastly, Shongwe was opposing the extradition case because he is currently facing a murder charge in the country which is an offence more serious than that which he is being wanted for in South Africa. Passing judgement on whether the extradition case should proceed or not, the principal magistrate said Section 9 of the Extradition Act states that the court must deal with the case and if it is found that Shongwe must go to South Africa, the court will proceed to take Shongwe to South Africa. He said the Extradition Act gives the provision that the Kingdom of Eswatini can postpone the surrender of the suspect so that the criminal prosecution in Eswatini could run its course.

Surrendered

The principal magistrate said if the suspect is facing a sentence in the country, that sentence will run its full length before the accused is surrendered to the requesting state. Khumalo said there is no prejudice to be suffered by the requested state or the suspect if an extradition enquiry is conducted while he faces a criminal charge in the requested

"By necessary implication, Shongwe

should only proceed in the event the case in the Mpumalanga High Court, has been dismissed," Khumalo said, pointing out that however it is trite law that court proceedings cannot be lightly stayed once they have been instituted.

He said a strong reason must exist if the proceedings are to be stayed. Khumalo said the fact that there is a case pending in Mpumalanga, which has a bearing on the case currently at the Manzini Magistrate's Court, does not pose a strong or exceptional ground that will justify a stay of the currently pending extradition proceedings.

Withdrawn

"There is no guarantee that the Mpumalanga case will take off any time soon.

It is common cause that at times cases fail to take off, at times cases may be withdrawn or removed from

Even if finalised, there is no certainty that the ruling will be in favour of the respondent," Khumalo said.

He also pointed out that it is not in the interest of justice to keep legal proceedings in limbo. The principal magistrate said Section 9 (1) of the Extradition Act states that such matters must be dealt with without undue delay.

He said the assertion that the Mpumalanga High Court can invalidate the warrant relating to the case dition based on three points of law; is saying that the extradition inquiry to collapse the pending proceed-

ings is nothing but speculation.

"This court has a duty to deal with the matter without any undue delay," Khumalo stated. The principal magistrate said once the court comes to the conclusion that the suspect is liable to be surrendered to the requesting state; it shall issue an order committing the accused to prison to await the minister's decision with regards to his surrender.

Suspect

The principal magistrate said, however, committing of the suspect to prison pending his surrender by the minister does not give the minister an automatic mandate to surrender the suspect to the requesting state.

"He must factor in certain considerations, Article 18 of the Extradition agreement between South Africa and the Kingdom of Eswatini provides that where the suspect sought to be extradited is also facing a prosecution or serving a sentence in the requested state (Eswatini), the requested state has an option of postponing the surrender of the suspect to the requesting state until the prosecution or serving of the sentence by that state is over," part of the principal magistrate's judgement reads.

"In light of the foregoing, it therefore follows that the points of law ought to be dismissed," reads part of the principal magistrate's deci-

Bail application hearing tomorrow

FRESH from being granted bail by the High Court fixed at E500 000, businessman Sipho Shongwe will once again fight to be granted bail by the Manzini Magistrate's Court.

The bail application comes after Shongwe failed to accessfully move an application opposing his extradition back to South Africa.

The opposing application was dismissed by Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo yesterday. Shongwe's attorneys immediately tried to move a bail application after their application to have the extradition stayed was dismissed but the crown informed the court that they were not ready to proceed with the bail application as they were of the idea that yesterday the court was going to deal with the extradition only.

Pleased

However, Shongwe's lawyer Sipho Mnisi informed the court that he was not pleased with the way the crown was handling the matter by merely saying the crown is not ready to deal with a matter while there is someone languishing in custody.

Mnisi further pointed out to the court that his client has just been granted bail by the High Court fixed at E500 000. However, he remains in custody after the crown filed an appeal against the bail order. It was finally agreed that the bail application will be made tomorrow at 9am at the Manzini Magistrate's

...'Shongwe free to sue state for unlawful detention

WITH murder suspect Sipho Shongwe having failed to successfully oppose his extradition back to South Africa, the fear is that he may end up being subjected to unlawful detention.

This is if it happens that he is extradited only to find that the papers used in the extradition process are invalid.

"The fear by respondent (Shongwe) is allegedly that he may be surrendered to South Africa and after sometime the warrant be invalidated having already spent some time in detention," the principal magistrate remarked.

He said in any event if at all such an occurrence occurs, it may be open to the respondent to sue for unlawful arrest and detention.

The principal magistrate said Shongwe can sue either South Africa or the Kingdom of Eswatini.

This is because Shongwe has argued that there is no registered criminal case in the requesting state (South Africa) and that there is nothing to show that he is wanted in that state in connection to criminal prosecu-

It was revealed in court that certain documentation has been relied upon and the court has been called upon to discharge the respondent in

terms of Section 10 (20 of the Extradition Act. Khumalo said the court has taken into consideration that the documents relied upon by the respondent in this regard are not authentic but they are just mere copies.


Khumalo said there is also a dispute of facts regarding the context in which these documents were lodged in the proceedings.

He said the respondent is contend-

ing that the documents prove that he has no criminal charges to face in South Africa while the applicant's attorney argued that the documents were lodged to show that the respondent applied for the South African identity documents at some point in time and for him to justify that he was entitled to such a document he had to provide information that he was facing no criminal charge is. South Africa.

Khumalo said this therefore creati 3 a dispute of facts which can be resolve through leading oral evidence.



BHEKITHEMBA 'Malindane' Mamba, a popular inyanga from Jabulani area outside Nhlangano, received gifts (Umhlambiso) worth over E250 000 from his in-laws.

Mamba, who is a polygamist with three wives, wedded his senior wife Calisile Mamba (La-Sihlongonyane) the traditional way over the weekend. He is considered one of the richest traditional healers not only in the Shiselweni region but also in the country. He boasts clients who are believed to be also prominent figures in society.

His senior wife La-Sihlongonyane is from Kubuta. The popular inyanga, whose clients include even those from nany parts of Africa, said the ceremony arted on Friday and ended on Sunday. e said his in-laws with other wedding nests from Kubuta arrived on Friday.

Guests

He said some of the guests were from far as Dvokolwako and others from a northern part of the kingdom as well from South Africa. On Sunday, which vas the main day, the homestead saw almost 2 000 people witnessing the colourful ceremony where the in-laws presented gifts to the Mamba household. At least four cows were slaughtered and according to Mamba; food was in abundance.

proud as almost every member of the family was also presented with something," said Mamba.

As *lobola* (dowry), sometime last year Mamba paid 17 herd of cattle to the Sihlongonyanes to tame his first wife, Calisile.

Meanwhile, Mamba said he spent a lot of money in preparing for the ceremony held over the weekend. He said he had to slaughter four cows for the event and stated that he was happy that from Friday up to the last day there was enough food for everyone.

"Such a ceremony is not just meant for only the couple's happiness but even those who are part of it should be catered for. I never received any complaints as all went according to plans," said Mamba.

Mamba said they were blessed with five children with his senior wife. He said they have been together for over 21 years. He was planning to marry his second wife, Happy Mamba (La-Makhanya) in the next couple of months almost the same way.

"I have to marry all of my wives the traditional way. I married them through the 'kuteka' but to make them feel special, it's important that we host 'umtsimba' which is what we are seeing today (Sunday)," said Mamba.

Plans

Mamba's third wife, who he also plans to marry the same way, is Lindiwe Khumalo. He could not state whether he plans to add another wife to the three he already has. Mamba is a well-known traditional healer whose home is always found busy as he is believed to be gifted in this trade. "He has customers throughout the country and some include businesspeople as well as church leaders.

His other clients come from many parts of Africa and at times you find vehicles all over the yard and you could be mistaken that a function is taking place when in actual fact these are his patients. He is a wealthy man who affords anything," said Hanson Fakudze, a close friend who was part of the organising committee of the ceremony.

Chairs and mats as well as other goods were reduced to ashes, including important documents," said Vilakati. Vilakati said with the old man confused what to do; neighbours rushed to the homestead and made efforts to put out the flames. "Little was saved as the flames were strong and it took quite a long time to have the fire under control. As the neighbours were fighting the flames, Nhlabatsi was standing a distance away and wept when realising that all his belongings

were up in smoke," said Vilakati.

Vilakati said Nhlabatsi; a widower living alone, now needs help. He said the old man lost his sons while his daughters were now at their matrimorial homes.

"All his sons passed away while two if not three of his daughters are now married and reside with their families.

They (daughters) do come to check on him but not all the time as they stay at their matrimonial homesteads. They have been alerted about the incident and I am told they have assisted him with something even though it's not much. The old man still needs help, especially a bed to sleep on. He also needs blankets and clothes as well as shoes," said Vilakati.

Vilakati appealed to anyone who may want to assist the old man to contact him at 7632 6941.

Is Mcebo Dlamini running for ANCYL presidency?

IS Eswatini born South Africa based political activist Mcebo Dlamini running for the African National Congress Youth League presidency?

This question begs an answer to reports that the former Wits University SRC president and #FeesMustFall activist is vying for the position which is currently held by outgoing President Collen Maine.

The party is expected to elect new members this month. There has been an argument that Dlamini being born in Eswatini makes him a foreigner and, therefore, he has no legitimate claims to the Youth League presidency. The argument was joined by Malaika Mahlatsi, who came to Dlamini's defence on the matter.

Mahlatsi is a South African writer, political commentator, essayist, blogger, columnist and television presenter. She is also a self-proclaimed feminist. In a long Facebook post, Mahlatsi blasted the faction of people who labelled Dlamini as a foreigner and she said what they are saying is vulgar.

"Firstly, a youth league of an organisation that prides itself on having an African nationalist orientation cannot engage a discussion at such a pedestrian level, especially because such an organisation is expected to have an appreciation of the history that gave birth to people like Mcebo,

who were born and raised in exile because of conditions that were not of their choosing. Secondly, unless things have changed, Mcebo holds a legitimate South African citizenship. The Constitution of the ANCYL clearly stipulates that membership is open to young people who hold South African citizenship. It doesn't say this citizenship is specific to only young people who were born in South Africa." she said.

Mahlatsi said the Youth League Constitution itself makes allowance for Dlamini to contest. She also said that throughout the years that Dlamini has committed himself to activities of the Youth League, no-one had raised the issue of him being bom in Eswatini.

"Why is a South African citizen born in Swaziland good enough to fulfil his obligations as stipulated in Article H in the Youth League Constitution but not good enough to exercise his legitimate rights as a member, stipulated within the same article?" Mahlatsi said she wouldn't personally support Dlamini if she was a Youth League member but to want to subject him to this vulgar test of authenticity was violent and a contradiction of the society the ANC claims it wants to fashion and more violent was the demand that he reveal who his father was.

"For what reason since that has no bearing on his legibility as that's already settled by his authentic citizenship?"

Mcb iynches on livestock thieves

TWO alleged livestock thieves from Maphungwane are lucky to be alive after they were attacked by a mob over the weekend.

The two alleged rogues are said to have been caught with a slaughtered cow on Saturday evening at a local forest. The livestock theft, which the residents said is becoming a norm amongst members of the community, has been going on for years. The said thieves were allegedly caught with the cow and were in the process of finishing the job before stuffing the meat and smuggling it out of the community to sell to restaurants at Siteki.

They are said to have been suspected after the three well-known livestock thieves were arrested a couple of months ago when they were caught in the same act. One of the three suspects was shot on the back of his knee by the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) when he decided to run for it when they were caught,

The said thieves are said to be between the ages of 35 and 40. These men are said to have been firstly caught an eye of two residents while they were from a local drinking spot at around 8pm. The passersby are said to have used a traditional trail by the forest to hide away from cars as they feared possibility of being run over due to their drunken state. "We were both drunk but I was not too drunk. We were instantly startled by a continuously moving

flash light rays coming from the heart of the forest," said the witness,

He said his mind slowly recalled that they have been experiencing the disappearance of livestock, especially cattle, for a while. The witness quickly dragged his companion by hand and forced him to run towards home.

They are said to have quickly rushed to a cousin's homestead, a victim of livestock theft, and notified him about their suspicions.

The said victim is said to have alerted other neighbours and they regrouped before heading for the forest. The two alleged thieves were beaten with fists, kicks and tree branches from around the forest.

"The community has been suffering the loss of cows for over a year now and we believed that they are being consumed by wild dogs or have lost their way back home," said the source.

In his affidavit, he submitted that he was arrested by the Buhleni police after surrendering himself and subsequently charged with murder before he was booked into the Pigg's Peak Correctional facility where he is currently kept.

"I wish to state I am innocent of the charges of murder and I will definitely plead not guilty since I did not intend to commit the offence. If admitted to bail, I will abide by all conditions and stand trial," he sub-

Masuku informed Mkhonta that a witness would be brought to court and testify that Mkhonta in fact hit another motorist and sped off, before being involved in the near fatal accident.

When asked if he had taken alcoholic beverages on the night of the accident, Mkhonta told the court he had only taken one glass of wine after having supper at the Calabash Restaurant.

"I had only gone for supper at Calabash and took only one glass of wine. I deny that I was on the wrong when the accident happened," Mkhonta submitted.

The matter is continuing at the High Court as more witnesses are to be paraded by both the plaintiff and the defence.

Woman arrested for falsifying age for army job

A 34-year-old woman I appeared before the Magistrate's Court after she was arrested for falsifying her age in a bid to appear eligible for army job recruitments.

Under normal circumstances, the army and other uniformed forces recruit individuals who are not above the age of 30. On special instances, the forces can recruit individuals who are above the said age, only when they are in possession of certain professional qualifications.

The accused person, Fortunate Maziya (34) of Maphungwane, was charged with contravening Section 33 (d) as read with

section 34 of the Births, Marriages and Death (BMD) Registration Act of 1983.

She is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully altered her actual birth date, 1984 and entered 1988 as her date of birth when registering for a birtil certificate at the Siteki government offices.

However, when the BMD officer entered the information in the computer system, it transpired that the accused had a registered certificate which reflected her actual age.

Maziya also faced a similar. charge on a second count, in that she proceeded and produced a false certificate to the BMD officer, purporting to be a genuine copy of her birth certificate while knowing that it had been forged. Maziya

appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso where she conducted her own defence.

When the charge was read to her, the accused pleaded guilty to the charge. Her plea was also accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence. During mitigation, Maziya asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying she committed the offence out of desperation.

She disclosed that she was desperate to join the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UESD), which is why she falsified her age. The accused was accordingly found guilty of the offence. She was sentenced to 30 days in a correctional facility for each count, which was, however, wholly suspended.



OUTSPOKEN Hlatikulu resident Mfeneziyamtfoba Magagula has claimed that he has been blocked several times from meeting His Majesty King Mswati III and present him with two cows as

Magagula said it's been three years now since he has been trying to present the King with the two cows without any success. He said this was despite that he has been following all protocol observed whenever one has a gift to present to royalty. He identified a number of people, including respectable ones in society, as the ones that were frustrating him. He was now not sure what to do in order for him to finally deliver the cows to the King as all attempts had been unsuccessful.

"I have been making arrangements with the relevant people, especially when the King visits the region, to be included in the list but this has not worked as at the end, excuses are given and they then advise me to wait for another time. This is frustrating me such that I can end up giving up in my quest of handing the King this gift. It's clear that there are people who do not want to see me presenting the King with

these cows. But these individuals must know that I am not going to give up," said Magagula.

"Just recently, when His Majesty was in the region for the Umhlanga ceremony, I approached the regional administration

office and was advised to register in order to make the presentation but this never happened. When I thought I would be afforded the chance, someone (identifying him by name) referred to me as 'lobhoncela, hence told me to forget being afforded any chance this year but wait for another time. He told me that it was only the businesspeople who would make donations to His Majesty," Magagula alleged.

He said the Regional Administrator Themba Masuku, as well as the Regional Secretary Zwakele Dlamini, were aware that he wanted to present two cows to the King. "They (RA and RS) are the ones who advised me to register so that I joined the list of people who were to present gifts to the King when he was here last month for the Umhlanga ceremony.

However, I was not afforded the chance and I am still bitter," said Magagula, emphasising that he would do anything to finally see his dream of presenting the King with the gift come true. When contacted, the RS Zwakele Dlamini asked to be given time as he was still busy.

"I am held up right now. I will call you later," said Dlamini when called at first.

On the second attempt, Dlamini once again asked to be given time, promising to call later. "I have not forgotten but I am still held up," said Dlamini.

SECURITY GUARDS FIRED, REPLACED WITH DOGS

ABOUT nine former security guards claim to have been dismissed from their jobs in favour of five easy to maintain security dogs.

The former security guards who are from Nkhaba, Maguga and Pigg's Peak, went on to claim that they had more than six years of experience in their jobs, only to be replaced in favour of the cheaper dogs.

The replacements occurred last week Thursday in Mbabane.

Due to the fact that the security guard company is yet to be reported to the Conciliation Mediation & Arbitration Commission (CMAC) offices, this publication will withhold the security company's name.

Speaking to this publication on Sunday, the dismissed security guards, who all preferred to remain anonymous, said they were dismissed for minor incidents on purpose.

"Some of us have worked at the security guard company for more than six years as basic security guards. A majority of our colleagues who joined the company with us have since left the company due to the low wages and long working hours. Unfortunately, for some of us, we could not find other jobs so we focused on this one. Last month, we overheard rumours that the company was planning to dismiss a few security

guards because they were not respecting the company policy. For us that was a lie because the company is so strict that one wrong move will see you dismissed quickly in the past," they

"The company failed to tell the truth. What was really happening was that the company was enjoying good profits and in an effort to boost these profits, the company decided to dismiss us. We were earning E1 800 monthly and were dismissed in favour of dogs that don't receive any monthly wages. The company began to dismiss us for very weak charges like arriving to work late or leaving security guard post repeatedly. Within the space of one week, about nine of us were dismissed while five dogs were added to the team. Tomorrow, we will report the incident to CMAC, they added.

When reached for comment, the company's human resources offic said the dismissed security guards are lying. "The dismissed individuals had been breaking company policies multiple times. We gave them notice and we brought the individuals bef a disciplinary committee which rus that they be dismissed.

It is true that the company ha acquired new dogs to bolster security staff but a dog cannot rep a human. I will wait for the phore call from CMAC so to defend tr. company," he said.

SITEKI MUNICIPALITY KICK-STARTS INCLUSIVE PLANNING, GOVERNANCE

FOR the country to realise its goal of being counted amongst well-developed countries by 2022, the general public needs to be incorporated in the implementation of development projects taking place in their surroundings.

This is what the municipality of Siteki is reportedly doing, involving the people in the planning and governance of the town.

According to the town clerk, Sithembile Simelane, the steadily developing town has recently implemented a programme which brings rate payers and the general public closer to the executive and let them voice out their suggestions. The programme is said to have been sponsored by the European Union (EU).

Meetings

Simelane said the council had already had inception meetings, whereby the council project staff and wards introduced the programme to the community. The meetings were conducted in all the town's six wards last week. Residents are said to have shown interest in the programme as they came in great numbers, especially during the last two meetings at Ward Five and Six. Simelane emphasised that the project solely focuses on empowering the Siteki community on inclusive planning and governance of the town. To ensure that the project works effectively, the council is said to have roped in two ward facilitators for each ward, and

their job is to intermediate in projects which would be implemented by the council in their respective wards.

"We are very much grateful to the funding by EU as we believe that this programme will improve service delivery as the people will now have a platform to voice out their concerns timeously, instead of waiting for an annual general meeting," said the town clerk.

Simelane was also echoed by Mayor Bhekumuzi Ngomane who pointed out that the programme will afford rate payers a sense of ownership to the development of the town.

Meanwhile, Simelane stated that the council would also open up a platform for rate payers to evaluate the effectiveness of the council.

Simelane said the exercise would work more like a satisfaction survey whereby the community will evaluate development projects which have taken place in their respective wards. The exercise will also lead to development of the people's own work plan which they shall implement, monitor and celebrate if it gets to be successful.



Spraying drone may cut costs for small scale farmers

A spraying drone which covers a considerable area in a short space of time may be the answer for small scale commercial farmers for effective production.

The drone which is known as a TTA drone is mostly imported from Beijing. One such drone was also showcased at KM III International Airport during the airshow which was hosted at the airport recently. Spectators who were also fond of farming showed interest in the flying equipment which was showcased by Sandile Matsenjwa.

Matsenjwa explained that the drone has come as a sigh of relief to small scale farmers who plough a number of hectares for commercial purposes. Such farming is most common in the sugar cane industry where small scale farmers then sell their produce to lager companies which in turn process the crop into sugar.

Matseniwa noted that farmers usually face high costs when it comes to spraying their crop for an increased production.

The spraying exercise normally requires a high workforce, something which increases the costs of the business.

However, Matsenjwa said such costs may be cut off by the use of the drone which is easily controlled by one person.

He explained that the drone which carries a maximum of 10 litres of liquid covers at least one hectare in 10 minutes. "This may effectively mean that a farmer would not need manual labour to spray the crops in a few minutes,' Matsenjwa said. Normally, large scale farmers use aircrafts to spray their crops. This may be too costly for small scale farmers who, in most instances, face financial challenges.

Herd of cattle reported stolen recovered near KM III Airport

COMMUNITY police of Malindza last week recovered a herd of cattle which was reported to have been stolen about a month ago.

A total of 12 cattle were recovered near KM III International Airport. This was disclosed by Malindza community police leader Seven Tsabedze when interviewed yesterday. Tsabedze said a resident of Malindza reported to have had his cattle gone missing since late August. The resident believed that the herd of cattle had been stolen after searching for it for over a month. Apparently, stock theft remains rife in the Lubombo region. Tsabedze said they had also uncovered that most stock which would be stolen from the area would be sold to butcheries and individuals as meat portions. After receiving the report of the missing cattle, Tsabedze said community police asked residents to be on the lookout for individuals who would



be selling meat portions in the communities. Butchery owners were also warned not to buy beasts from individuals who have no proper documents to prove ownership.

While continuing with the search, Tsabedze said community police eventually recovered 12 cattle which were found loitering near the airport. "We believe that the cattle had been kept

stolen, but the person who stole them failed to sell them after residents had been warned of a missing herd of cattle," Tsabedze said.

Meanwhile, Tsabedze disclosed that community police were currently looking for a herd of 33 goats, believed to have been stolen from three homesteads about two weeks ago. The goats were grazing when they were allegedly stolen.

MAN FINED E1 000 FOR POSSESSION OF DAGGA

A man of Sitsatsaweni was fined a sum of E1 000 after he was nabbed carrying a pack of dagga weighing 362 grammes while in a public space.

Mancoba Sangweni (28) appeared before the Siteki Magistrate's Court where he faced a charge of contravening the pharmacy Act. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully possessed dagga, a potentially harmful drug which he kept in a money bag.

When the charge was read to him, the accused pleaded guilty. He told the court that he was actually carrying the said drug for medical purposes. The accused said he was informed that the drug could cure



chest pains, something which he was suffering from. He then pleaded with the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying that he was a first time offender. He was accordingly found guilty by the court and sentenced to 60 days in a correctional facility with an option to pay E1 000 fine.





DISTINGUISHED LEADERSHIP OF DR SB DLAMINI - A DECISION MAKER

OF the many essential key attributes needed for distinguished leadership, decision making is very fundamental.

I never had the opportunity to work closely with the late Dr Sibusiso Dlamini Former Prime Minister of Eswatini.

However, I must say that observing him from a distance over time, I can strongly say that he was a decision maker.

Leaders are people that are demanded to at times to make tough and difficult decisions. Sometimes they have to make decisions that will be very unpopular - but if those decisions are made in good faith and in the best interest of the people, the people get to appreciate it afterwards.

On the other hand leaders that shun decision making are bad leaders - because one way or the other, the organisation they lead will suffer and eventually fail.

When decisions are not taken, the organisation gets trapped and be where it neither moves forward nor backward. In fact indecisiveness is a key attribute of bad leadership, leaders by design have to make decisions, as to whether they are good or bad that is a topic on its own.

H E Dr SB Dlamini, a decision maker

Dr Sibusiso Dlamini was a decision maker and that became evident in 2008/9 when the government of Eswatini experienced a fiscal crisis and had to deal with issues of cash flow that adversely affected the public sector.

In that sticky situation, the World Bank said the government of Eswatini should review the public sector Wage Bill and consider downsising.

In a nutshell, the World Bank said government was to send people home. But knowing the economy of the country and the high unemployment rate that we continue to experience, Dr Sibusiso Dlamini and his Cabinet took a stance that government will not cut civil servant to ease the heavy Wage Bill (a situation that still exits).

Only a leader of the stature of Dr Sibusiso Dlamini would stand against a recommendation of such a highly reputable recognised international institution to say 'NO" we are not doing that.

I must say when I read that statement on the press. I was like "ok that is a man that can stand his ground". Dr Dlamini took a stand to say yes things are rough but we are not moving an inch forward from here.

As a nation we ought to recognise and applaud the attributes that Dr Dlamini possessed.

The different decision making styles

Generally business leaders are faced with dozens of decisions that need to be made every day.

As the organisations grow, the decisions generally become more frequent, more complicated, and have more serious ramifications.

Sometimes it is not about making the right decision, but just making a decision at all.

At times leaders have to make quick decisions in highly chaotic environments and that needs innovative free thinkers with the ability to make rational decisions with limited information under very stressful circumstances and that is often that is a scenario many political leaders exists in.

Dr Dlamini handled himself well in making decision even in tough times. Again I will say I am not sure what decision making styles Dr Dlamini used in his tenure but there are four basic decision-making styles that leaders opt for; (sourced form Gleeson 2012).

Command - Command decision-making is where leaders make decisions without consulting their teams. This is an effective style, especially when things are moving quickly and the team is looking for immediate guidance. In a business setting, leaders use this style the most effectively on large financial decisions and in crisis

● Collaborative - Collaborative decision-making is when leaders gather their teams and request feedback and insight. The leader still makes the final call, but is armed with the proper data to make a more informed decision. This can also be referred to as evidence-based decision-making.

Consensus - Consensus-based

decision-making is done more like a democratic vote. Leaders gather their teams and everyone votes. Majority rules. This process can work well when the outcome of the decision affects the entire team, and generally will not immediately affect the b tom line.

In a quick-moving business ronment, this is not the most eff way to make a decision, but the still some decisions that can be this way. Leaders need to reme that you generally cannot alwaplease everyone.

ed by trusted peers, sometimes the best decision a leader can make is to not be the one to make a certain decision. Complete delegation has many benefits including measuring the decision-making abilities of your managers, empowering your team, and maintaining your own sanity.

By handing over some decisionmaking responsibilities, leaders are also building a better management team and giving them the confidence they need as their responsibilities increase. And, convenience-based decision-making is a great way to avoid the decision trap of "we have always done it this way." New decision makers take fresh approaches to solving problems.

Similarly, business owners, executives and managers must master the ability to make good decisions quickly in order to keep the business moving forward.

The best leaders, however, know when they need input from the team. Good leaders surround themselves with trusted advisors and subject matter experts, so that they can access a constant flow of data to make better decisions.

Dr Dlamini was outstanding in decision making and the country will remember him tor that.



How Ugandan media has borne brunt of censorship for decades

THE world watched in outrage recently as Reuters photojournalist, James Akena, was clobbered by three soldiers on the streets of Uganda's capital Kampala in full view of television cameras.

Akena was covering the demonstrations for the release of Robert Kyagulanyi, a Member of Parliament and pop singer also known as 'Bobi Wine.'

Yoweri Museveni, who has been the East African country's president for the past 32 years, tried to explain away the attack.

He said he'd been informed that it was a case of mistaken identity – Akena had been mistaken for a camera thief.

But for many in the media this was nothing new, as intimidation and violence is an almost daily threat. Uganda is now ranked 117th out of 180 countries in Reporters Without Borders' 2018 World Press Freedom Index, five places lower than in 2017.

Uganda has a long history of media censorship.

The country's first post independence head of government, Milton Obote who became prime minister in 1962, banned the intellectual Rajat Neogy's Transition magazine. Idi Amin overthrew Obote in 1971 - during his regime, key journalists disappeared without trace.

The press was a central target during the second Obote government between 1980-1985 and its militiary successor.

Museveni's rise to power in 1986 was met with relief. It's almost quaint to think back to a time when Uganda, under a newly elected Museveni, was held as a paragon of African democracy with all the freedoms it entails.

The period of hope

In 1990, four years after Museveni came to power, the country was still experiencing a new political dawn. A Danish-produced documentary (still available in the archives of Uganda Broadcasting corporation television), then investigating the depth of freedom of the press in Uganda, was clearly enthralled.

The narrator exclaimed that:

"A free press in Africa, a rare thing in Africa."

Until the mid-1980s, Uganda had been a political basket case.

Mere differences of political opinion and free expression were deathly taboos. But the new political class that toppled the autocratic regimes of Obote and General Tito Okello announced the arrival of a new dawn.

As the then youthful Museveni was sworn-in as the head of state on the steps of the parliamentary buildings in early 1986, he declared:

"This is not a mere change of the guard but a fundamental change."

The Danish documentary featured one of the rising stars in the media

firmament, then editor of the respected (now defunct) Weekly Topic, Charles Onyango Obbo.

He spoke on camera about the trustworthiness of the new political class, because "many of them come from liberal backgrounds".

In fact many of the new political class were in fact hardliners on the left

Obbo's Editor-in-chief Wafula Oguttu was just as effusive about the future of a free press. He pointed out that it was guaranteed under the Ugandan constitution and it could not be desecrated.

Reversal of freedoms

But things started changing for the worse in the mid-1990s.

This included the government shutting down media platforms, legal threats, the infiltration of newsrooms by security spies, thuggery, intimidation and withholding of advertising from institutions deemed to be critical of the government.

As respected Ugandan radio host and media scholar, Samuel Kazibwe said, in addition to political pressure, economic pressure, an oppressive legal regime and even cultural or religious factors, the main censor has become, the political one because it even has the capacity to close a media house without following any legally laid down rules and procedures.

Some notable examples stand out.

In 2009, four radio stations, including Kazibwe's CBS radio were closed down for a year.

Owned by the Buganda monarchy, the largest of Uganda's four kingdoms, CBS radio had given full coverage of riots in Kampala and neighbouring towns following the central government's restriction on Buganda's prime minister travelling to a culturally contested part of the kingdom.

The government closed the station, alongside other stations, claiming that they were fanning insecurity in the country.

In 2013, the independent Daily Monitor was shut down for more than a week after publishing a letter alleging that Museveni was grooming his son to succeed him. Its sister radio stations KFM and Dembe Radio were also occupied by police and closed down.

Government also regularly takes journalists to court. Obbo appeared in court 45 times between 1997 and 1999.

Commercial threats are also used. Oguttu accused the government of deliberately denying their paper adverts right from its infancy in 1993.

And then there are the bribes. Research has highlighted censorship that takes the form of bribes – nicknamed "brown envelopes".

These are often doled out to journalists to write favourable stories and to ignore the controversial issues. Kazibwe says that there are incidences where these powerful organisations have arm twisted media organisations to sack certain journalists because they believe they are out to collapse their companies.

Fast forward to 2018. Despite Museveni's flimsy excuse for the assault on the Reuters' photographer – the reason was clear:

It is part of an ongoing and systematic form of censorship designed to stifle freedom of the press in Uganda.

Tackling issues

Despite all the threats and challenges, the media in Uganda continues to tackle controversial issues and break big stories of corruption and abuse of power. Nation TV's On the Spot,

NBS TV's Frontline, Capital Radio's Capital Gang, and Radio Simba's Gasimbaganye ne Bannamawulire, as well as CBS Radio's current Affairs programmes continue to court politically controversial topics.

They host government critics and civil rights activists who openly speak out.

The president also allows press conferences where probing questions are asked which continue to at least afford a semblance of press freedom in the country in spite of the lurking iron fist.

NHLANHLA NENE UNDERMINES RAMAPHOSA'S INTEGRITY TICKET

JOHANNESBURG - Nhlanhla Nene's position as finance minister has suddenly become untenable, both for the country and President Cyril Ramaphosa's campaign to clean up corruption in government.

This follows Nene's shocking revelations that he did not only "bump" into members of the Gupta family, but he also paid a visit to the family's private home more than five

Nene has apologised for failing to disclose earlier the extent of his encounters with the Guptas. The days leading to his appearance at the Zondo commission have been dramatic by any measure. The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) had threatened to spill the beans about Nene's dealings with the Guptas unless he fully disclosed it at the commis-

Whatever the EFF knows about Nene, it is only Nene and the EFF who know the veracity of the damage that might be caused by revelations of such information.

It is not principled of the EFF to blackmail Nene; the fighters should just release the information in the public interest, and not keep it for their political mileage against Nene or the ANC. The reality, however, is that it is within the context of the EFF's blackmail that Nene admitted to have met the Guptas at their private home several times.

The problem is, therefore, with the timing and nature of Nene's disclosure. It is not clear at this point if Nene has disclosed all there is to know about his encounters with the Guptas. He seems not to see anything wrong with a finance minister giving an audience to a private family simply because one of the family members studied economics.

During the time Nene met with the Guptas, the family was allegedly consolidating their control over government institutions, including various government departments. Therefore, it makes no sense that whilst the Guptas were meeting people with the sole purpose of furthering their interests and hold on state institutions, their interest in Nene was purely to

discuss the interesting subject of economics. Even after apologising, there are lingering questions regarding Nene's timing in terms of his disclosure - why he kept quiet for such a long time with such material information.

Nene betrayed many people who staked their reputation by going all out in supporting him after he was fired. During that time, he had an opportunity to walk away and not come back to Treasury as someone with integrity. By accepting to be appointed as part of the 'new

dawn', Nene has made Ramaphosa's clean-up campaign hit a wall. How does Ramaphosa now justify removing controversial ministers and other officials who have been directly implicated in state cap-

If Nene stays as finance minister, it will be difficult for some to believe in his medium-term budget policy statement. Nene's situation undermines Ramaphosa's integrity ticket. The entire anti-corruption stance is called into question when the finance minister is not beyond reproach. The position of finance minister is a serious one; it is the most important department in terms of reading the president's strategic direction regarding the economy and good governance.

With Nene as finance minister, Ramaphosa's message becomes somehow hazy.

CAPE TOWN - Former president Jacob Zuma is set to be summoned before the ANC's top six to explain his recent mysterious meeting with highprofile ANC leaders in KwaZulu-

Natal, which has sparked allegations of a plot to oust President Cyril Ramaphosa.

The ANC wants answers on the alleged Maharani Hotel plot meeting last month. Among the details sought is clarity on the coincidence that current and former leaders of the party who had previously lobbied against a Ramaphosa presidency - including Secretary-General Ace Magashule - found themselves all in one place at the same time without any prior arrangement.

Luthuli House was at the time neither aware of, nor informed about, any planned meeting involving Magashule, whose position

as secretary-general is akin to that of chief executive officer of the governing party.

The high-level probe is to be presided over by Ramaphosa himself as he gradually stamps his authority in the 90-member ANC national executive committee (NEC).

Authority

Ramaphosa's assertion of his authority is in contrast to earlier perceptions and criticism that he was finding it difficult to lead the divided ANC following his election as party leader, which took place in December at Nasrec, south of Johannesburg.

Those expected to be summoned before the top six to explain the alleged plot include Zuma, former North West premier Supra Mahumapelo, ANC Women's League Secretary-General Meokgo Matuba, ANC Youth League KwaZulu-Natal leader Thanduxolo Sabelo and ANC members who attended the NEC meeting last weekend at Saint George Hotel in Irene, Tshwane.

Leaders

Discussions about the plot were held after inputs by a number of ANC leaders, including former deputy finance minister Sfiso Buthelezi, Head of the NEC's subcommittee on economic transformation Enoch Godongwana and ANC Veterans' League President Snuki Zikalala.

An NEC member said most of those attending the meeting wanted the matter to be given serious attention.

SAFETY CRITICAL IN 'HANDIGAS' USE

PRINCIPAL Secretary in the Ministry of Natural Resources and Energy Winnie Stewart feels that safety should come first in the use of Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) which is also known as handigas.

Stewart advised on the importance of taking caution when using LPG gas especially for domestic purposes. "If you smell LPG inside your home keep flames and cigarettes out of the affected room and away from the area.

"Turn off all gas appliances, turn off the gas supply at the LPG cylin-

der(s),"she said.

Even though the country's LPG market is currently small, Stewart advised that when using LPG gas cylinders consumers should open doors and windows to ventilate the area at all times.

In addition, she advised consumers against the use of mobile devices around LPG.

"Contact your LPG retailer or a licenced gas worker immediately to check the installation.

"If the smell persists in the house go outside to a safe place away from the building. Ensure all fixed LPG installations are fitted and serviced," she said.

Stewart also stated the impor-



tance of keeping LPG appliances and fittings in excellent condition and having them regularly serviced.

The ministry of natural resources and energy assisted in the formation and launch of the LPG association of Eswatini. The association brings together the LPG suppliers.

The ministry and the LPG association were at the Eswatini International Trade Fair to educate the public on the different appliances that utilise this energy source and its benefits.

Certain aspects of the business an accountable institution conducts will pose greater money-laundering risks than others and will require additional controls to mitigate these risks, while others will present a minimal risk and will not need the same level of attention.

In implementing the risk based approach, financial service providers (FSPs) should have in place processes to identify, assess, monitor, manage and mitigate money laundering and terrorist financing risks.

RISK BASED APPROACH APPLICATION

The obligation to adopt a risk-based approach for the prevention of ML/FT is one of the key elements in the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) Recommendations 1 states that 'Countries should identify, assess, and understand the money laundering and terrorist financing risks for the country, and should take action, including designating an authority or mechanism to coordinate actions to assess risks, and apply resources, aimed at ensuring the risks are mitigated effectively.'


Based on that assessment, countries should apply a risk-based approach (RBA) to ensure that measures to prevent or mitigate money laundering and errorist financing are commensurate with the risks identified.

The Money Laundering and Financing of Terrorism (Prevention) Act 2011, as amended, requires that an accountable institution should put in place appropriate processes to identify, assess, monitor, manage and mitigate money laundering and financing of terrorism risks, including but not limited to a sector (sector).

including but not limited to, risks that may arise in relation to

the development of new products, business practices and delivery channels or risks that may arise through the use of new or developing technologies.

IMPLEMENTING THE RISK BASED APPROACH

The risk based approach or assessment process should be comprehensive, transparent and well documented. When completing the risk based approach effectively, the end result should create reliable conclusions necessary to establish appropriate policies, procedures, processes and systems required to develop the FSPs ML/FT Programme.

RISK ASSESSMENT

The risk assessment should form the basis of a FSP's RBA. It should enable the FSP to understand how, and to what extent, it is vulnerable to ML/TF. The risk assessment should always be proper-

ly documented, maintained and communicated to relevant personnel within the FSP. It should also be commensurate with the nature and size of the FSP's business.

In identifying how the FSP may be vulnerable to ML/TF risks, the following sources of ML/TF must be considered:

Products or services - An important element of a risk assessment is to review new and existing products and services that the FSP offers to determine how they may be used to launder money or finance terrorism.

Customer risk - A vital step in risk assessment is the analysis of the users of the products and services that the FSP offers. This factor looks at the various types of clients, such as individuals, listed companies, private companies, partnerships, financial institutions and others who want to stablish a relationship with the FSP.

Geography - Assess whether your own office

location, the location of your customers, the countries to which you transfer funds, and the countries from which you receive funds could pose a high risk for ML/TF activities.


Delivery Channel - Assess the manner in which the FSP delivers its products, assess all your products, services and delivery channels to determine if they pose a high risk of ML/TF.

Nature, size and complexity of the FSP - Assess other factors that may apply to the FSP that makes it more attractive to individuals who want to carry out illicit activities.

RISK RATING AND SCORING

Risk is dynamic and needs to be continuously managed. It is critical that risk ratings accurately reflect the risks present, provide meaningful assessments that lead to practical steps to mitigate the risks, are periodically reviewed and, when necessary, are updated. Below is an example of a risk scoring matrix one can use.

IN order to keep up with the ever changing world of technology, the Swaziland Standards Authority (SWASA) has been encouraged to grow its income generating base as this will also help in deepening and expanding their services.

This is contained in the Public Enterprises Unit quarterly report for June 2017. "A growth in income will help fund the resuscitation of the organisation to meet its mandate in the face of rapid technological advancement. SWASA plays a critical role in improving the competitiveness of the economy, standards form the basis of quality and are key to creating global confidence in our products," the report states.

According to the report, SWASA went through a strategic planning exercise to establish the strategic direction that they should be taking for the next three years. The new strategy seeks to ensure that the organisation plays a crucial role in the development of SMMEs by inculcating a standards based culture and making sure that the conformity assessment services within the organisation mandate is available to the SMMEs and other industry players. "The services include but not limited to enhanced training services, quality systems and product certification, and testing services.

It also provides for a structure which allows for multiskilling of staff in standardisation, training and certification areas," the report said.

SWASA received 14 complaints in this period which comprised of electronics, services and clothing. Eight of those companies, according to the report, were successfully investigated and closed out. "Four of these complaints are still pending investigations whilst two cannot be investigated as complaints could not produce proof of purchase," the report said.

ERRATIC weather patterns are not exactly a pleasant scenario and especially not the global rising of temperatures.

Yesterday, the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change released a much anticipated report describing ways in which to limit the rising of global temperatures to 1.5 degrees Celsius and preventing dangerous warming. The report shows there are ready-to-go solutions that can help achieve the target, rapidly reduce the rate of warming, and prevent millions of premature deaths from air pollution each year.

UN Environment suggested in a press statement yesterday that one way of reducing runaway warming is to act right away to reduce highly potent but short-lived climate pollutants (SLCPs) like methane, tropospheric ozone, hydrofluorocarbons (HFCs) and black carbon. Fast and immediate action on SLCPs can avoid over half a degree of warming by 2050. Drew Shindell, Professor of Climate Sciences at Duke University and a lead author on the IPCC report, said no scenario exists where the world can get to 1.5 degrees without reducing these highly potent, but short-lived climate forcers alongside CO2.

"The report emphasises that reaching low warming targets is so challenging that we need to use all the options at our disposal. Since they typically have relatively low costs, least-cost mitigation pathways tend to maximise SLCP reductions," Dr Shindell said.

UN Environment alluded to interlinkages between climate change and air pollution. "Reducing these pollutants not only protects the climate but also promotes clean air. Acting now can prevent two and a half million premature deaths from air pollution each year, and save more than 50 million tons of food crops annually," UN Environment said in a statement. "Without action on short-lived cli-

mate pollutants, there is little chance to reach the Paris Agreement's 1.5°C goal. Reducing these pollutants must be done in addition to a fast switch to a low-carbon economy," Helena Molin Valdés, Head of the Climate and Clean Air Coalition said.

"Short-lived climate pollutants are the 'low hanging fruit' in the fight against climate change. We have the tools and proven technologies and policies to help countries achieve immediate reductions, and by doing so we can solve air pollution and climate simultaneously."

Existing solutions include replacing HFCs in refrigeration and air conditioning and properly disposing of them; reducing methane from waste streams (including food waste) and from agriculture; expanding clean cookstoves and phasing out black carbon emissions from heavy duty engines like trucks buses and ships; and reducing methane leakage from oil and gas production.





here is a quiet optimism about the job at hand for Construction Associates, exhibited in an interview of the man who has just been handed the portfolio of driving the company into new adventures.

The company has gone about its business with the quiet efficiency that is only matched by its professionalism and sticking to its original values dating back to when it was registered in Swaziland in February 1977. Back then, the company was 80% owned by the Lonrho PLC Group.

Fast forward to 40 years later and CA has made a mark throughout the Kingdom of Eswatini with beautiful and resilient structures. Its impressive resume includes the



Republic of China on Taiwan Embassy, the Nkhotfotjeni building as well as the Corporate Place, and some brilliant projects such as Liqhaga, Estel House, The Hub, and Mavuso Sports Centre.


"We are the building arm of Inyatsi," states De Sousa, explaining the relationship between the two companies.

he company was registered in Swaziland in February 1977 and was at that time 80% owned by the Lonrho PLC Group. Under its General Manager, Jeff Perring, the company won its first contract to build some rural schools.

Since then the company has gone from strength to strength, building a variety of structures inckuding factories, factory extensions, multi storey office blocks, shopping complexes, a distillery, bridges, culverts, water filtration plants, water and sewer pipelines, etc.

In 1999 the Lonrho shareholding was bought out by the local management as part of Lonrho disinvestment programme.

At that time Jeff Perring, Chris Simoes, Phil Perry and Alistair Lyle became directors and shareholders.

Since becoming independent from Lonrho, the local management were able to substantially re-invest in the company to provide it with a secure footing for its future operations.

In the years since the Management Buy Out (MBO), the company's capital base and investment in plant and equipment has expanded substantially.

Construction Associates is being capacitated to handle more and larger contracts to meet the E500M annual turnover target, set by the Group.

cent annually in turnover. This is not bad, considering the state of the economy. To this, however, Bester sees things differently. He says that the building industry is definitely on a high; "we are not negative about the future!"

The company has diversified its portfolio to stand it in good stead for the future. "I do not think we have reached the peak yet," reveals

As one who has been around for a while, having joined in 2010, Bester outlines the values that have remained the backbone of the company for decades.

He believes that they still have a lot to achieve, explaining why bringing someone like De Sousa is an important strategic move aimed at giving them an edge in the industry, with a view to incorporating the skill that he brings into the company.

But what is essential to the success CA has enjoyed, according to Bester, is that "everybody is very happy" at CA. "The clients are important to us; they must feel comfortable that we too know what we are doing," De Sousa chips in.







aving being in Eswatini for more than 40 years, Construction Associates has firmly emblazoned its footprint in the Kingdom.

The company is responsible for some of the most iconic buildings in the country, including (in Mbabane) the Republic of China on Taiwan Embassy, High Court of Eswatini, the New Mall, and Eswatini Sugar Association, and (in Manzini) Liqhaga, Estel House, The Hub, and

Asked what sets Construction Association apart from other construction companies, Estimation Director xxx Dlamini said simply "it is our product, what we offer, and we are proud of it. Construction Association offers a quality product tied with timeous delivery and that is what we boast about as a company. Most of the buildings that we have erected over the years are still standing and we have not received any complaints from our clients".

This commitment to quality and resilience have seen to the company's survival even through tough economic times while other companies have been forced to close shop.

Dlamini noted that Construction Associates has been able to weather economic storms through diversifying its portfolio and not relying on government for business.

'At Construction Associates we do not put all of our eggs in one basket. We do not heavily rely on government projects only for our growth. We also focus, to a large extent, on the business we receive from the private sector, which from time to time comes in as a valuable substitute and they usually approach us with readily available finance as opposed to the lengthy processes of payment from government. This is fundamentally what has kept Construction Associates afloat when many others sank," he said.

Dlamini emphasised that no job was too small

CONSTRUCTION ASSOCIATES NOT FAZED BY ECONOMIC DOWNTURN

espite the current unfavourable economic situation which has seen government plunging into a financial crisis and projections of sluggish growth in the private sector, Construction Associates is more than ready to prove its mettle in the industry.

Estimation Director xxx Dlamini acknowledges that the construction industry is highly volatile, mainly because the sector is extremely sensitive to any slight changes in the economy.

"In our projections, the activities within the industry these days seem to be taking a dive. However, this comes after a big boom over the past two years. For instance, in 2016 and 2017 Construction Associates was busy working on big projects, key ones being the Hilton Inn in Mbabane and the International Conference Centre (ICC) in Ezulwini," he said.

However, Dlamini said forecasts



point to a dive in the sector, which he noted was part of the nature of the industry. Adding, the estimation director said the current unfavourable economic challenges faced by the Kingdom would also impact negatively on the industry's activities.

"If our Government has financial problems, it becomes difficult for investors to invest in infrastructure development, which is why Government is encouraging public-private partnerships to ensure that whilst the situation on the economy is negative, the con-

struction of economically viable projects does not get affected," he added.

Dlamini said Construction Associates has been part of some of these public-private partnership procurement processes in the last six months, however, he said none

of these had taken off so far. Adding, he said the challenges posed by the current economic environment makes the competition stiffer for big companies that are keen on quality and employ a sizeable number of

"Similar to any other sector, business in this industry is always up and down. The building construction industry is highly volatile. If the economy is performing positively, the construction industry blossoms but if economic performance is low, the construction industry is always first to respond," explained the estimation director.

He cited 2007/8 when South Africa experienced an economic boom emanating from the World Cup, while on the other hand the market in Eswatini dwindled and as a result most businesses left for the neighbouring country to take advantage of the opportunities that were available there.

Dlamini said during the economic meltdown the construction industry was the first to "feel the pinch mainly because the construction of assets like residential houses or just mere buildings seemed like a luxury that people could not afford. Therefore, if the economic performance of a country is not at its best, it means that people do not have the funds to finance infrastructure development projects".

Adding, the estimation director said on another level, poor economic performance translates to an inability by government to prioritise on infrastructure projects, but instead, the focus then shifts to other focal areas that suffer the effects of the meltdown like health and the provision of food for the marginalised, to name a few.

CIC MUST ADDRESS ISSUES OF UNFAIR COMPETITION

hile Construction Associates is confident of its position in the industry and embraces competition, the company feels the categorisation of other industry players needs to be addressed by the regulator.

"Competition in the construction industry has been escalating as more companies are being established. Construction Associates finds absolutely nothing wrong with the increasing number of competing companies, however, the challenges is in the categorising of these companies by the Construction Industry Council," said Estimation Director xxx Dlamini. The Construction Industry Council (CIC)

is the regulatory body of the construction indus- do not just find themselves in a category where try. Explaining, Dlamini said the categorisation system tends to wrongly group competing companies without taking into consideration their sizes.

"This promotes unfair competition because a company with a broad structure and employs a sizeable number of people cannot be placed at par with a company that is being managed and run by one individual who plays different roles and only hires as an when a project arises," he said.

Dlamini said to improve the sector, the Construction Industry Council needs to revise the manner in which it categorises industry players to ensure that small and new entrants

the majority of industry players in that category were big companies.

"Smaller companies or new entrants could be assigned to a category where they can aspire to grow and end up being in the top categories. At the moment new entrants find themselves in the highest category and this leads to reduced motivation to grow. If this could be resolved, then the competition would be fair and equal at all levels," he said.

In addition, Dlamini said there should be thorough screening of new entrants into the market. He said this would help eliminate applicants who do not qualify to carry out projects

within the industry. He said if such screening measures were not implemented, it could result in standards in the industry dropping because of players who lacked understanding of what the job entails and the challenges that come with the industry.

The current under-budgeting problems that we observe today are a result of quantity surveyors relying on outdated information on the industry to carry out current jobs," added the estimation director.



ot every advertised project is as lucrative as it may seem on paper, hence it is important to scrutinise every opportunity before considering it.

Construction Associates Estimation
Director xxx Dlamini says the company makes it a point that due diligence is done for any advertised
tender before it can be considered.
"One of the factors we look for are
the risks attached to that tender
and whether or not the tendering
company has the capacity to finance
the project," he said.

Also considered, Dlamini said, was the consultancy team involved in the project.

He said this was key because the construction company needs to get an idea of who they would be working closely with on the project. Furthermore, he said it was

also important to consider the geographical location of the project, as this determines whether the company has the suitable resources to carry out a perfect job in that particular area.

"Most importantly, Construction Associates takes into consideration the projects the company is carrying out at that moment.

This helps to determines if we have suitably skilled personnel available to carry out the job accordingly. It also ensures that the company does not find itself overstretched, thereby compromising the quality of the service delivered," he observed.

When it comes to costing a project, Dlamini said pricing is influenced by a variety of factors including the costs of labour, material, overheads and equipment that would be used in the project. He however acknowledged that pricing in the construction industry was very tricky.

Dlamini said the challenges encountered during pricing includes mainly situations whereby information meant to guide the pricing process is ambiguous, inadequate or the company is given a very short time to prepare all the necessary documents for a tender.

He said despite the challenges though, Construction Associates always comes up with ways to counter the situation. The estimation director said the company uses qualified, experienced and polished skills to fill up any information gaps in a tender. He said through past experiences, the company was able to include the necessary factors which may have been erroneously left out but may be key in the project.

"This ability by Construction Associates helps the client avoid circumstances where a company tenders and somewhere along the project they realise that their pricing was too low and they can no longer afford to financially source all the material which, even though not quoted in the tender, were inevitably a requirement for completion of the project," he explained.



20 dead as limo headed to birthday celebration crashes

NEW YORK - A limousine carrying four sisters, other relatives and friends to a birthday celebration blew through a stop sign and slammed into a parked SUV outside a store in upstate New York, killing all 18 people in the limo and two pedestrians, officials and victims' relatives said on Sunday.

The weekend crash was characterised by authorities as the deadliest US transportation accident in nearly a decade. The crash turned



a relaxed Saturday afternoon to horror at a rural spot popular with tourists viewing the region's fall foliage. Relatives said the limousine was carrying the sisters and their friends to a 30th birthday cel-

ebration for the youngest.

"They were wonderful girls," said their aunt, Barbara Douglas, speaking with reporters on Sunday.

"They'd do anything for you and they were very close to each other and they loved their family."

Douglas said three of the sisters were with their husbands, and she identified them as Amy and Axel Steenburg, Abigail and Adam Jackson, Mary and Rob Dyson and Allison King.

Interpol president who vanished in China accused of bribery

BELJING-The former president of Interpol, who has been reported missing while on a visit to his native China, is being investigated for bribery and other crimes, Beijing announced.

Meng Hongwei, who only resigned as head of Interpol yesterday, vanished after sending his wife a WhatsApp message with a knife emoji two weeks ago.

Beijing said Meng, who is also China's vice minister for public security, is being investigated due to his own 'wilfulness and for bringing trouble upon himself', but remained tightlipped regarding his whereabouts.

The revelation that China's system of shady and often-arbitrary detentions could ensuare even a senior public security official with international stature has cast a shadow over the image Beijing has sought to cultivate in recent years as a modern country with the rule of law.

The Chinese Ministry of Public Security released a statement yesterday, saying the investigation is a result of Meng's 'insistence of doing things his own way' and he 'only has himself to blame'.

They said the investigation into Meng's suspected acceptance of bribery and violation of law was 'very timely, completely correct and very wise' and 'fully demonstrates that anyone who violates the law must be severely prosecuted and severely punished'.

Meng's unexplained disappearance in China late last month had prompted both the French government and Interpol to make their concerns for his wellbeing known publicly, which put pressure on Beijing.

DEATH TOLL FROM INDONESIA QUAKE NEARS 2 000

INDONESIA - Nearly 2 000 bodies have been recovered from Palu since an earthquake and tsunami struck the Indonesian city, an official said yesterday, warning the number would rise with thousands still missing.

The death toll from the twin disaster on Sulawesi island that erased whole suburbs in Palu has reached 1 944, said local military spokesperson M Thohir.

"That number is expected to rise, because we have not received orders to halt the search for bodies," Thohir, who is also a member of the government's official Palu quake taskforce, told AFP yesterday.

Missing

Authorities have said as many as 5 000 are believed missing in two hard-hit areas since the September 28 disaster - indicating far more may have perished than the current toll.

Hopes of finding anyone alive have faded and the search for survivors amid the wreckage has turned to gathering and accounting for the dead.

The disaster agency said the official search for the unaccounted would continue until October 11 at which point they would be listed as missing, presumed dead.

The government has said it will declare those communities flattened in Palu as mass graves and leave them untouched.

Gopal, whose aunt and uncle are missing, picked through wreckage on Monday knowing just days were left to find his loved ones.

RIO - Bolsonaro easily beat a dozen other candidates on Sunday, but not by enough to avoid an October 28 showdown with

A deeply polarised Brazil stood at a political crossroads yesterday as the bruising first round of the presidential election left voters with a stark choice in the run-off between far-right firebrand Jair Bolsonaro and leftist Fernando Haddad.

Bolsonaro, an ultraconservative former paratrooper, easily beat a dozen other candidates on Sunday — but not by enough to avoid an October 28 showdown with Haddad, the former mayor of Sao Paulo.

Bolsonaro won 46 per cent of the vote to Haddad's 29 per cent, according to official results.

That tracked closely with pollster's predictions, but Bolsonaro charged that "polling problems" had cheated him of outright victory in the first round, which required him to pass the 50 per cent threshold

Some of his supporters protested outside the national electoral tribunal in the capital Brasilia, chanting "Fraud!"

That anger reflected the uncertain outlook for the second round.

Surveys suggest Bolsonaro will have the edge, but that Haddad will draw nearly even with him after picking up substantial support from the defeated candidates.

"We expected to win in the first round," one Bolsonaro voter, 77year-old retiree Lourdes Azevedo, said bitterly in Rio de Janeiro.

"Now things are more difficult: the second round is a risk."

'Golden opportunity'

Haddad, addressing his own supporters, called the looming runoff "a golden opportunity," and challenged Bolsonaro to a debate. *AFP*

The German news agency dpa reported on Sunday that emptying Tietjensee Lake near the city of Bremen would take several days. After that, investigators will look through the muddy lakebed for evidence. Jutta Fuchs, a young German mother, disappeared in 1993.

WASHINGTON - North Korean leader Kim Jong Un has agreed to hold a second summit with US President Dona. . rump as soon as possible, Seoul said on Sunday. US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said "he agreed with Chairman Kim to hold the second US-North Korea summit at the earliest date possible," South Korea's presidential office said in a statement.

The two sides agreed to "continue talks to decide on the specific time and location for the second summit", Pompet told South Korean President Moon Jae-in, following his meeting with Kim in Pyongyang.

Oil spill feared after ships collide

PARIS - French maritime authorities are trying to contain an apparent oil spill after two merchant ships collided in the Mediterranean Sea north of Corsica. A spokesperson for the regional French maritime authority said no one was injured in Sunday's collision, and the size and exact nature of the spill remain unclear. Two French ships were sent to the area and specialists were helicoptered in. The Italian coast guard also sent an aircraft to monitor the operation and three ships to help contain the spill. The French spokesperson says a lack of wind gives authorities hope the spill can be contained quickly. He was not authorised to be publicly named.

Armored vehicles sent to foreign soil

TOKYO - A small contingent of Japanese troops and armoured vehicles engaged in military exercises with the US and the Philippines in the Philippines on Saturday, assisting in a humanitarian role during an amphibious exercise simulating recapturing territory from a terrorist group. A total of about 150 troops took part in the landing on Saturday. Fifty Japanese troops, unarmed and in camouflage, followed four of their armoured vehicles ashore, moving over beach and brushland while picking up Filipino and US troops playing wounded.

JERUSALEM - Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's wife, Sara, appeared in court on Sunday for the first hearing in the fraud trial against her, in which she is alleged to have misused state funds in ordering catered meals. Zulu king wants guarantee that Trust will be untouched in land reform

DURBAN - Land belonging to the Zulu nation will not be expropriated by the national government, Zulu King Goodwill Zwelithini told thousands of people attending the annual Shaka Day celebration in Durban on Sunday.

Using his annual speech at the event - which marks the death of the Zulu nation's most famous leader Shaka -Zwelithini demanded that President Cyril Ramaphosa not only visit him Ingonyama Trust would not be targeted in the country's much-debated land reform programme.

Ramaphosa's previous visit in June caused a stir when he was accused of kneeling before the king at the official palace in Nongoma in Northern KwaZulu-Natal. Ramaphosa later explained he was merely bending down to show the king a book on cattle.

Zwelithini has been particularly vocal

again but give guarantees that the about the nation-wide debate on whether or not to change the Constitution to allow the state unfettered power to expropriate land without compensating the owner. His anger stems from recommendations made in a report called the 'High-level panel on the assessment of key legislation and the acceleration of fundamental change,' chaired by former president Kgalema Motlanthe and released in November last year.

In the report, it was stated the Ingonyama Trust was likely unconstitutional and its existence should be reviewed in any land reform debate. It also questioned why the trust provided few services to those occupying the land, yet it generated in excess of R96 million from rentals. The trust owns about 29.67 per cent of mostly deep rural land in KwaZulu-Natal, which covers an area of 94 361km2. While Zwelithini is the sole trustee of the land it is divided according to clans and overseen by traditional leaders.

Speaking in isiZulu as he addressed the crowd at Moses Mabhida Stadium, Zwelithini said Ramaphosa "must come down to KwaZulu-Natal with something in black and white to assure all the Zulus that their land will not be touched". The Shaka Day celebration was expected to be held on September 24, but was postponed after the sudden death of Zwelithini's son Butho Zulu. Butho was the son of Zwelithini's second wife queen Buhle kaMathe. Shaka Day is the presumed date of Shaka's death in 1828, ANA

NHLANHLA NENE ASKS RAMAPHOSA TO FIRE H AS FINANCE MINISTER

CAPE TOWN - Nhlanhla Nene has reportedly asked President Cyril Ramaphosa to be let go as the minister of finance.

This comes after mounting pressure from a number of political parties over his testimony at the commission of inquiry into state capture, according to a report by Business


Nene admitted last week that he attended a number of meetings with the controversial Gupta family at their Saxonworld home and businesses in Midrand.

The minister then issued an apology to the South African people for his failure to disclose the information. Nene has been under enormous pressure to resign.

Factions within the ANC have been discussing potential replacements that they could suggest to President Cyril Ramaphosa, three senior party officials said, asking not to be identified because the information has not been made public.

Former deputy finance minister Mcebisi Jonas is considered a frontrunner, along with South African Reserve Bank Governor Lesetja Kganyago and one of his deputies, Daniel Mminele, the party officials

into State Capture last week about the meetings with the Guptas after previously having said he had only met the three brothers on social occasions, prompting opposition parties to call for him to step down.

4 dead, 13 injured in N3 collision between SUV and taxi

JOHANNESBURG - Four people died while 13 others were injured in a minibus taxi crash on the N3 in Spruitview, according to Ekurhuleni emergency medical services spokesperson William Ntladi.

"Police responded to a motor vehicle crash on the N3 highway opposite Spruitview. Upon arrival we found that a minibus had collided with an SUV," Ntladi told News24 yesterday morning.

Four out of the 15 passengers in the minibus were declared dead on the scene.

"Thirteen passengers, both dri-

vers inclusive, have been transported to various hospitals in the City of Ekurhuleni for medical care," Ntladi added.

The cause of the fatal crash is yet to be determined.

The N3 has since been closed, and commuters have been urged to find an alternative route.

Law enforcement agencies are currently on the scene investigating. "It might take an additional 30 minutes from now before we can open up the route again as we are still cleaning up the site," Ntladi said.

Pravin Gordhan gives ex-ministers cause to quake at state capture inquiry

JOHANNESBURG - Public **Enterprises Minister Pravin** Gordhan will draw former Cabinet colleagues Lynne Brown and Ben Martins into the statecapture matrix when he tells the Zondo commission on Friday how they tried to push the government into mega-deals that

were ultimately blocked by the National Treasury.

Gordhan will also testify that in 2013, during his first term as finance minister, forpresident Jacob Zuma made it clear to him that the nuclear deal had to go ahead.

Gordhan will be the second serving cabinet minister to give evidence at the inquiry after Finance Minister Nhlanhla Nene's dramatic testimony last Wednesday when he admitted meeting the Guptas seven times.

Gordhan's evidence will be preceded tomorrow by that of former public enterprises minister Barbara Hogan.

Gordhan has been asked by the commission to give evidence about his dismissal in March 2017, when he and his deputy Mcebisi Jonas were removed from the finance ministry in a midnight reshuffle.

Gordhan will inform Judge Raymond Zondo about the issues that caused a breakdown in his relationship with Zuma and hostility towards the Treasury, according to members of his team.

Central Bank to reduce MTN demand

ABUJA - The Nigerian Central Bank may reduce the amount it has ordered SA telecoms firm MTN to repatriate as part of an ongoing disagreement, Central Bank Governor Godwin Emefiele said. MTN and the central bank are in a dispute over the transfer of \$8.1bn of funds which the bank said the company had sent abroad in breach of foreign-exchange regulations. Nigeria accounts for a third of MTN's annual core profit."

Judge slaps travel ban on rights lawyer

CAIRO - An Egyptian judge has slapped a travel ban on a former presidential candidate and rights lawyer over an ongoing investigation into funding for civil society groups. Investigating Judge Hisham Abdel Meguid issued the ban on Saturday, the latest in a series of similar steps targeting rights lawyers critical of the government of general-turned-president Abdel-Fattah al-Sisi, which has placed draconian restrictions on the work of rights and prodemocracy groups.

Court orders critic be released on bail

RWANDA - A Rwandan court ordered the release on bail of a vocal critic of President Paul Kagame who was barred from running against him in an election last year. A High Court judge said in the ruling that Diane Rwigara and her mother, who was arrested along with her last year, would be released immediately but that they were not allowed to leave the capital Kigali "without authorisation". AFP

Plane impounded as man sues for \$1m

WINDHOEK - A Zimbabwean man is trying to sue Air Namibia for \$1m after airline officials allegedly barred him and his family from travelling to Turkey.

The pending court action saw an Air Namibia plane impounded in Harare last Friday, disrupting travel plans for dozens of Windhoek-bound passengers. Harare High Court Judge Tawanda Chitapi authorised the sheriff of the court to attach Air Namibia's property, including planes, pending the finalisation of the case in which Zimbabwean family man Chenjerai Mawumba is suing the airline for "pain, suffering and trauma".

TUNIS - A boat carrying migrants trying to reach Italy from Tunisia capsized overnight, killing one person, a security source in the north African country said. The makeshift vessel transporting the young Tunisians from Zarzis, in the south of the country, had been at sea for about 21 hours, said a source in the local security services. It overturned near the Tunisian island of Djerba at around 03:00, and soon after fishermen raised the alarm and the National Guard intervened, the Guard's spokesman Houssemeddine Jebabli said. The body of one migrant was recovered, seven were rescued, and two other people fled, he said, adding they were suspected of being the boat's captain and the person who organised the crossing. While their number has decreased, many Tunisians still risk their lives by trying to cross the Mediterranean to reach Italy in search of work or a better life.



Illegal miners try their luck in Mozambique ruby rush

MAPUTO - Deep inside a forest, sweating men haul earth out of rough excavation holes and carry it in bags on their backs to a stream.

Then they sift for the small, red stones that could make their fortune - miners say they have sold single rubies for thousands of dollars, many times the local monthly wage which is typically under \$200.

In northern Mozambique, informal - and illegal - ruby mining is a tough business that has attract-

ed thousands of itinerant workers despite strenuous crackdowns by police and private guards.

Accessible

The ruby deposits, which were discovered only nine years ago, are relatively accessible in shallow ground, triggering the sudden birth of a frantic wildcat mining industry.

Mozambique now accounts for 80 per cent of global ruby production - but the illegal mining is a far cry from the giant mining companies and the chic auction houses in Singapore where millions of dollars of gems are sold.

"I'm here because of poverty," Faque Almeida, 46, who has spent much of the last eight years in the forests of Montepuez in search of the blood-red gemstones, told AFP.

He said he left his home province of Nampula, 400km south, unaware that it was illegal to look for rubies in Montepuez district after the government sold the rights to a large mining company.

"I was unemployed. When I left my home, I thought that breaking into the owner's door is a crime, but I did not know that digging the land is also a crime," said Almeida.

"Last year I was arrested, I stayed in jail for 14 days.

I was released when my family paid 14 000 meticais (\$240) to the police," he said, holding a pickaxe in one hand.

Montepuez Ruby Mining (MRM), a subsidiary of London-based Gemfields, won the mining rights to 36 000 hectares of ruby-rich land in Mozambique in 2011.

MUGABE'S SON-IN-LAW 'WANTED BY POLICE'

HARARE - Former Zimbabwe President Robert Mugabe's son-in-law is wanted by police on allegations he detained a senior airline company official against her will, a newspaper reported.

Simba Chikore allegedly had Zimbabwe Airways Legal Head Bertha Zakeyo detained for two hours at the airline's offices in June.

One of Chikore's alleged accomplices, security guard Simbarashe Mutimbe appeared at the Harare Magistrate's Court on Saturday. He was granted bail of \$30, reports The Standard.

The guard is alleged to have "unlawfully deprived Zakeyo of her freedom", the paper said. It added: "According to the prosecutors, Chikore is still at large".

'Unsanctioned meetings' In June, Chikore is alleged to have written to Zakeyo, ordering her dismissal for holding unsanctioned meetings and leaking company secrets. Zakeyo was allegedly detained at her office for two hours by security guards and denied access to her lawyer, the private Daily News reported at the time.

Chikore, who is married to Mugabe's daughter Bona, was last seen in public at the inauguration of President Emmerson Mnangagwa in August. The couple attended the ceremony in place of Mugabe and former first lady Grace, who were both unwell.

Nigeria's Buhari to face political heavy-weight opponent in re-election bid

ABUJA- Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari will run for re-election in February 2019 against former vice president Atiku Abubakar, a Muslim from the country's north who was nominated on Sunday as the main opposition party's poll contender.

Buhari, a 75-year-old former military ruler, was the sole candidate for his ruling All Progressives Congress (APC) party, so his confirmation by some 7 000 delegates gathered in the capital Abuja was a mere formality on Saturday.

The APC swept to power in 2015 with the first opposition victory at the ballot box in the country's history.

But next year's presidential race appears to have tightened in recent months with the APC hit by a wave of defections over Buhari's leadership style.

On Sunday, delegates to a weekend convention of the former ruling Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), nominated Abubakar, 71, as his challenger for next years poll.

The politician and business tycoon has made four previous attempts at the top job in Nigeria, Africa's most populous nation.

Abubakar comes from the Muslim-majority north, and his nomination follows an unwritten rule in Nigeria that the presidency should alternate every two terms between a candidate from the north and south. *AFP*

Abubakar wins primary to challenge for presidency

ABUJA - Former vice president Atiku Abubakar will challenge incumbent Muhammadu Buhari for the Nigerian presidency early next year after winning the opposition Democratic Peoples Party primary, an AFP reporter at the vote said on Sunday.

Abubakar, 71, won 1 532 votes, trouncing his main rival Aminu Tambuwal, the governor of northern Sokoto state

who scored 693 votes at the party's convention in the south-eastern oil hub of Port Harcourt.

"Thank you for choosing me," Abubakar said on Twitter. "It's a victory for all of us.

Results

The task to get Nigeria working again starts now," he wrote, even before final results were in

Twelve candidates were in the running for the DPP nomination, decided in the weekend primary by some 3 000 party delegates.

Abubakar has already run for the presidency four times. He has amassed a huge fortune in the import-export business, as well as oil, agriculture and telecommunications.

Nigerians will elect governors and lawmakers as well as the president in elections set for February and March next year.

ENCAC DISOWNS ACASWA EXECUTIVE COMMITEE

THE mother body of music and arts associations in the country ENCAC has denounced existence of an ACASWA executive.

ENCAC stands for Eswatini National Council of Arts and Culture whilst ACASWA stands for the Association of Christian Artists in Swaziland.

Following the court order issued to ENCAC CEO Stanley Dlamini to not dare interfere with affairs of the ACASWA, the CEO has stated that there is no ACASWA executive as they dissolved the committee led by Mzwakhe Myeni a month

"We do not have an ACASWA executive as we speak. We dissolved the team led by Mzwakhe Myeni last month due to the corruption that was unfolding within the association. We wrote them a letter a month ago informing them to hand over ACASWA documents, equipment and any other related

affairs led by Mzwakhe Myeni. As far as I'm concerned, ACASWA does not have an executive committee. We removed them a month ago following the mischief that has been happening in the office since they were elected," said Dlamini.

According to the CEO of Arts and Culture, the ACASWA executive committee refused and neglected the responsibility to account and report on grants received for 2017.

"The committee has not paid annual subscriptions which were due in April. A lot has been happening since Mzwakhe took over. He had problems with everyone he was working with; from the treasurer of the association to the members," Dlamini added.

Last month, the ENCAC CEO, through a letter, anounced the dismissal of the ACASWA executive committee.

It read; 'Following the several

engagements with ACASWA executive committee led by Mr. Mzwakhe Myeni on the maladministration in the national arts association, wherein the executive committee has refused and neglected the responsibility to account and report on grants received for 2017.(sic)

'Despite being granted reasonable time to correct and address the critical issues being raised by Council; the executive committee members have failed to meet its obligation of accounting 0 government

allocation. "The Council is compelled to remove

ENCAC calls special meeting for **ACASWA** members

MEANWHILE, the Eswatini National Council of Arts and Culture has called a special meeting for ACASWA members on Saturday at Caritas in Manzini at 9am, wherein Council shall present its predicament to gospel artists in the kingdom.

In the meantime, the executive committee has been advised to hand over ACASWA documents, equipment and any other related material to the office of the CEO.

ACASWA MEMBERS DIVIDED

A majority of the ACAWA members are not happy with the new committee that was elected last year.

One of the gospel stars who asked to remain anonymous, said Mzwakhe was not supposed to be the president in the first place because he is not a trustworthy artist.

"I was expecting this. Myeni was not supposed to be elected in the first place. We know his history with this presidential seat. He just wants money. That's all. It is all about them not the gospel artists. The new committee is not doing what they are supposed to do as the leaders," said the gospel artist.

"In as much as I don't pay much attention to this association, Myeni is not the right candidate for the job. I pity the team he is working with because said another artist.

Whilst some artists feel as though someone is overstepping their mandate, others say ENCAC is exercising its

One musician stated that they were baffled as to how a person could dissolve what they had worked so hard for overnight.

Mzwakhe calls AGM, again

ACASWA President Mzwakhe Myeni is still calling the shots as he has again summoned artists to an AGM slated for October 21.

This AGM follows the one that failed to take place last month, September 16 for reasons the president cited as 'national elections and the death of a former back-up singer'.

The upcoming AGM, according to Myeni, will have agenda items such as the presidential report, Siyewela Crossover, Ezomoya/ ACASWA show in Nhlangano, Trade Fair, Arts and Culture recognition, to name a

The agenda for this upcoming AGM is slightly different from the initial one as in this new agenda; the topic of members who resigned from the association has been removed.

It is unclear as to why five members of an executive committee could all resign one after the other. When reached for comment, they all claimed there were personal reasons that led them to relinquish their duties in the executive. It is also worth noting that the association's secretary general, public relations officer and vice president were together when a reporter from this publication contacted them to confirm their being recalled to the office. The Secretary General Apostle Vusumuzi Maculuve pleaded that the reporter confirms individually with each member that they had been summoned back, even though they were together. The purpose of that meeting could not be ascertained.

- September 18 ACASWA President Mzwakhe Myeni recalls all resigned members back to office. They resume
- 24 September ENCAC issues letter of removal of ACASWA executive committee from office and calls for meeting slated for October 13.
- October 5 ACASWA takes ENCAC to court.
- October 8 ENCAC refutes existence of ACASWA executive commitee.
- October 8 ACASWA calls AGM slated for October 21.



Crazy Soweto

So, where do I even start?

Perhaps let me start with the road to the recording of the album.

They say there's a thin line between bravery and stupidity, and I must admit that we really pushed the boundaries on this one.

How does a little known, upcoming musician from the Kingdom of Eswatini decide to host their solo recording in the heart of Soweto, where

they are lesser known?

My team was so confident it was the best thing to do in terms of access to the best facilities and equipment we needed to give us the quality we required for this production.

Building up to the day, four other big shows were confirmed in the area, either on the same date or within seven days of my confirmed date, not to mention that I would miss the NACA's 50/50.

Lebo Sekgobela confirmed her recording a week after mine at Rhema Bible Church in Randburg, Collen Maluleke confirmed his recording in Southgate on the same date as mine, Dumi Mkokstad confirmed his recording a week later in Durban, and visiting American gospel musician Tod Dulaney confirmed his concert in Johannesburg on the same night. Not exactly a confidence booster ahead of what was already a long shot. Again, the team said, we are doing this.

Typically, as an upcoming artist, you want to bring in a more established artist to feature in your project to draw attention to it and give it a certain profile.


I remember having supper with the

Fast forward to the night of the recording, the production team arrived at the Theatre at 9 am having travelled overnight from Swaziland. Unbeknown to me were the difficulties they had faced the night before, some having lost their valuables and dealing with mixed up accommodation bookings. Bright-eyed and bushy-tailed they arrived as if nothing had happened, spirited lot they are, God bless them!!

We had been refused access to the venue the night before the show for set up, so it was always going to be a mission to get ready on time. Hour after hour, as I saw pictures of the setup coming through, the belief came back, this was really happening!!!

Looking back, the jury is still out on whether it was bravery or stupidity, but that was the highest point in my career and simply the best night of my life. The support from my fellow countrymen was overwhelming, choosing the lesser travelled road is not always easy, but the results make up

PARIS - Teenage sensation Kylian Mbappe insisted that he "should have cored more" despite netting four times in a magnificent individual display as Paris Saint-Germain thrashed Lyon on

The 19-year-old scored four goals in the space of 13 second-half minutes as a 5-0 victory saw PSG set a new French top-flight record of nine straight wins to start a season. But Mbappe did miss several earlier chances as he was thrice denied when oneon-one with Lyon goalkeeper Anthony Lopes and struck the post before grabbing his first goal just after the hour mark.

"I missed opportunities, I should have scored more," he told Canal+. "Tkeep working and I never doubted. I knew I had the support of my team-mates. I often say that as long as an attacker is creating chances, everything is fine."

Mbappe took the World Cup by storm in the summer, becoming the first teenager since Pele in 1958 to score twice in the final and winning the award for the tournamenis best young player. He has started the new Ligue 1 season in similar fashion and already has eight goals to his name from just five appearances.

PSG are already eight points clear at the top of the table after breaking an 82-yearold record set by Olympique Lillois in 1936, as Mbappe looks to win the title for the third straight campaign after also lifting the trophy with Monaco in 2016-17.

"It was the work of the whole team, but the most important thing was the record," he added. "I insist we talk

Arsenal announce switch from Puma to adidas in £300m kit deal from 2019

Meanwhile, Manchester City struck a deal worth £50m a year with Puma to supply their kits from the 2019-20 season in August.





Kevin Tway wins maiden PGA Tour title

NAPA - Kevin Tway birdied his last five holes, three in a playoff, to win his first PGA Tour title on Sunday at the Safeway Open, where Brandt Snedeker squandered a five-shot lead in the final round.

Tway rolled in a 10-foot birdie putt at the third hole of sudden death to win the first event of the US tour's 2018/19 season over Ryan Moore at Silverado Resort in Napa, California.

Snedeker, who started the day with a three-shot lead and led by five with 11 remaining in regulation, fell by the wayside with a par at the first playoff hole.

Moore matched Tway's birdies at the first and second playoff holes, before succumbing at the third - the par-four

10th. "I'm kind of at a loss for words," said Tway, the 30-year-old son of 1986 PGA Championship winner Bob Tway.

"I think I birdied my last five holes that always helps."

He had birdied 17 and 18 in regulation to complete a one-under par 71 at Silverado Resort in Napa, California, finishing tied with Moore and Snedeker on 14-under par 274.

Snedeker started the day with a threeshot lead and stretched the advantage to five after birdies at the fifth and seventh before slumping with four bogeys on the back nine. That included three in a row at 10, 11 and 12, and that was enough to see his lead evaporate as Moore birdied 15, 16 and 18 to reach 14-under with a five-under par final-round of 67.

"I was just able to put together a round of golf," said Moore, who had six birdies and just one bogey.

"On a day like today it's not about necessarily how you're swinging, it's about how you just get the ball in the hole and somehow I managed to do that."

Snedeker briefly regained a one-shot lead with a birdie at the par-five 16th, where he rolled in a 10-foot putt.

But he immediately gave the shot back at the 17th, where he was far left off the tee and in the pine straw under a tree. He found a bunker at the par-five 18th and settled for a par and a two-over 74.

Hazard wants dream Real Madrid move

LONDON - Eden Hazard has claimed he does not want to end his Chelsea career like Thibaut Courtois – but has again refused to commit his future to the club.

The Blues playmaker is the Premier League's top scorer after taking his tally to seven in the win at Southampton on Sunday.

But the Belgium is out of contract in 2020 and has yet to start formal talks over a £300 000-a-week extension.

Courtois ran his contract down before forcing a move through to Real Madrid in the summer. Hazard again stated his "dream" has always been to play for the Spanish giants yet insisted he will copy Courtois' tactic of delaying talks until the final year of his deal.

"I don't want that," he said. "I want what's good for me, but I want what's good for the club because the club has given me everything. I don't want to say 'yes I am signing a new contract' and then in the end I don't end up signing.



"So I will see. In my head, sometimes in my head I wake up in the morning and think I want to go. Sometimes I think I want to stay. It is a hard decision. It is my future. I am 27 and I will turn 28 in January."

During the World Cup, Hazard cast doubt on his Chelsea future by claiming it was "everyone's dream" to play for Real Madrid. He has since stated he will remain at Stamford Bridge until the end of this season while keeping his options open.

But speaking after the win at Southampton, he gave an insight into his inner turmoil after Maurizo Sarri's side have made a strong start to the season. *Mirror*



Change Imbube Marathon route - Tsatsa

ATHLETICS – EXPERIENCED Zimbabwe-born long distance runner Tabitha Tsatsa has appealed to the Imbube Marathon organisers to consider changing the route to avoid athletes' injuries among other perils that come with Eswatini's premier marathon route.

Tsatsa, who banked yet another E25 000 on Sunday after winning the 42.2km ladies category for a historic third time on the trot, said the magnitude of the Imbube Marathon is killed by the nature of the route which causes long term injuries.

The 42.2km race starts from Somhlolo National Stadium in Lobamba to Mbabane and back; with seven kilometres Malagwane Hill. In essence, athletes run seven kilometres uphill and another seven downhill, which

causes long term injuries that can make a runner not perform to his or her best in future events.

"The uphill is too much and even worse it's the same length downhill almost immediately- that is bad for muscles, can cause serious long term injuries. The magnitude of this race is huge, pays well and it should be the perfect event local athletes can use to qualify for the World Championships or Olympics but with the current route, it's impossible. To qualify for these events (World Champs and Olympics), a female athlete needs to clock 2:42:00 hours and it cannot be achieved here," Tsatsa said.

Tsatsa clocked an impressive 3:04:32 hours to win Sunday's Imbube Marathon, her third in a row in as many years, and was closely followed by Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) Athletics Club's Winile Mnisi on a time of 3:09:20 hours.

"Please let me comment after we have met with his family on Wednesday," Gwebu said.




"It is sad to lose a player of his calibre as he was showing glimpses of being a good defender.
