Pakistani businessman granted E150 000 bail for forging King's signature

ne of the Asian nationals who were arrested for allegedly forging His Majesty the King's signature has been eventually granted bail which was however fixed at E150 000 cash by the High Court.

The High Court also ordered that the Pakistani National Akmal Muhamed should also provide sureties to the amount of E500 000 before he is released from custody

High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi yesterday issued the order and further stated that Muhamed is to remain in the Kingdom, Manzini in particular at Magevini flats House number 74 until his trial is finalised and further report to the Sigodvweni Police Station every day at 4pm.

At least two businessmen of Pakistani origin are expected to stand as surety and property to the said E500 000.

The Pakistani national was granted bail after his legal representative Advocate Mduduzi 'Tsotsi' Mabila instructed by lawyer Linda Jele, made lengthy submissions on his behalf before Judge Nkosi arguing that he will not abscond trial.

• He is also expected to report to the Sigodvweni Police station daily at 4pm

The Crown represented by Banele Magagula had been vigorously opposing his bail application and he has been in custody since his arrest in January this year.

In his bail application, he had alleged that he is in the process of completing a shopping complex after being allocated land at Lomahasha and that Swazis stand to have gainful employment from it.

According to Akmal, who had filed an urgent bail application, he denounced his Pakistani citizenship after obtaining a Swazi one and to demonstrate that he is rooted in the Kingdom, he alleged that he is in the process of completing a shopping complex at Lomahasha.

E900 million Phuzumoya Strategic Oil Reserve Project:

GOVERNMENT PULLS PLUG ON KANTEY & TEMPLER

espite the company's reported backing from Netherlands and global oil giants VTTI in the construction of the E900 million worth Strategic Oil Reserve at Phuzumoya, government has pulled the plug on Kantey and Templer Swaziland, the project managers.

The project facility at Phuzumoya in the Lubombo region is now expected to return to the tendering phase.

The Observer on Saturday can reveal that government through the ministry of natural resources and energy is in the process of terminating its relationship with Kantey and Templer further throwing the project into turmoil after it has experienced a number of upheavals since His Majesty King Mswati III commissioned its construction in 2013.

Exactly on October 18, 2013, the King, amid great expectations and relief, got on an excavator and conducted a sodcutting ceremony to mark the official launch of the construction of the strategic oil reserve.

Then, it was announced that the multimillion job was a joint venture between the Kingdom of Swaziland, American Tank and Vessel (Pty) LLC, Kuwait and other stakeholders.

With thousands of jobs expected to come out of the project, His Majesty, then, thanked American Tank and Vessel for bringing a project of such magnitude into the kingdom.

As those gathered for the launch cheered, the King said: "The project that I bring to you today is one that is geared into transforming lives and take the entire region into higher heights.

After protracted upheavals pertaining to the initial contractor, it was then reported in November 2014 that Kantey

and Templer Swaziland had been awarded the tender to construct the oil reserve with an assurance that at least 300 locals would be employed during the twoyear period of construction.

About three years later after commissioning and having obtained feedback from the ministry that indeed the project had no glitches and was continuing according to schedule, the King, during the official opening of Parliament in 2016 encouraged investors to take advantage of the project.

Fast forward to February 2018, Principal Secretary (PS) in the ministry of natural resources and energy has indicated that government is ready to pull the plug on Kantey and Templer.

"The contractor did not meet the agreed upon timelines and we are working within the framework of the agreement for the next steps in this project. It is envisaged that the project will be returned to tendering in the very near future," said the PS in a statement to the Observer on Saturday.

In September 2016, Director of Energy in the Ministry Henry Shongwe told the Observer on Saturday that there was no need to press the panic button as the project would commence earnestly in October that year. He had explained that the delay had been due to some few loose ends that needed to be tied up by the contractor. "We have received everything from the contractor even the plans and work should begin in October. That is what they have promised us. The project is expected to take 18-24 months to complete. We are very excited as government as the constant delays have also troubled us. The reserves are very important to the country especially during cases where there unrests in the neighbouring South Africa resulting in strike actions in the energy sector. Its

Despite this, contractor readies to resume works Thursday ith everything that is cur-

rently ongoing pertaining to the Strategic Oil Reserve Project at Phuzumoya, the contractor Kantey and Templer insists that their sub-contractor Inyatsi Construction is ready to resume works on Thursday.

An official from Kantey and Templer wondered how the situa-

construction will go a long way in addressing this," he stated then.

A project appraisal by Kantey and Templer towards the end of last year revealed that the first phase of the project that included earthworks was already complete and it has been estimated that about E5 million has already been injected into this phase.

Sounded

Engineers from Inyatsi Construction found on the site, sounded optimistic that the project would duly be commissioned by late this year and confirmed that the first phase of the project had been complete. At the time, there were already stable foundations for heavy plant machinery to move around as construction continued. An assembly point for steel works was also already in place.

Phase II, which entails bulk earthworks, civil works, mechanical, and electrical works is expected to begin earnestly next week and this, therefore, means that employment opportunities are still available in the project as soon as this phase commences. What will come as good news especially to the people of Phuzumoya and surrounding areas is that the promised employment 'out 300 people throughout the contion turned out to be like this when they have met all requirements and have their sub-contractor ready to resume building works.

The engineers also confirmed that the tanks area foundation would begin earnestly while the construction of offices was also expected to begin soon. Proper construction began in August and an assurance that the project was still on course for commissioning next year was given. To further allay fears that the contractor would fail to deliver the project timely, Netherlands' VTTI, which backs Kantey and Templer Swaziland in the local project managed to deliver timely the renowned Burgan Cape Terminal (BCT), Cape Town's first independent oil storage and distribution terminal that was officially opened in the Eastern Mole of the Port of Cape Town last year.

Inyatsi Construction is supervised by Chemie Tech, the same company that supervised works at the Cape Town terminal. The Swazi project embraces the construction of a 90 million litres national strategic fuel facility, which will ensure that the country's energy sector assumes its central role in the development of the country and economy.

In its glowing credentials, Kantey and Templer Swaziland boasts of backing by top oil traders and engineers including the Netherlands based New York

nti-Corruption Commission Commissioner Advocate Thanda Mngwengwe's contract is said to have elapsed.

Sources close to the matter have revealed that Mngwengwe's contract ended at the end of last month.

The Anti-Corruption commissioner is appointed by His Majesty the King according to Section (4) (1) of the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006 on the advice of the Judicial Service Commission.

The Act further states that he shall hold office for a period not exceeding five years and may be re-appointed for a single term, on such terms and conditions as may be determined.

The King had appointed Mngwengwe into this position in January 2013.

At the time of his appointment, Advocate Mngwengwe was assisting the Director of Public Prosecutions in the CTA corruption case, which saw then CTA General Manager Polycarp Dlamini spending about five years in jail.

It is no secret though that Mngwengwe had a rough relationship with the Judicial Service Commission who have been going for his heard since the time of fired Chief Justice Michael Ramodibedi.

The JSC then preferred to work with former ACC Deputy Commissioner Lillian Zwane or current Second Deputy Commissioner Ndiphethe Mabila. Even though it has not been stated publicly, the ACC boss has always been viewed by the JSC as taking orders from the Executive arm of government, in particular the prime minister's office.

Whilst previous attempts to get rid of him failed, which included spurious allegations made against him and a so-called petition from ACC staff to the CJ.

The not so healthy relationship played itself out when the ACC made an exparte application for search and seizure of assets against former Commerce, Industry and Trade Minister Gideon Dlamini and two others before the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala in 2016.

Chambers

Whilst the application had been made in chambers, the CJ decided to make his ruling in public where he struck down some sections of the Prevention of Corruption Act and dismissed the application, saying some sections of the Act were unconstitutional.

That ruling still stands pending appeal in the Supreme Court and the then minister and his partners were never searched nor charged for the alleged offences.

This is the same case that worries the Prime Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini who in his book is concerned about the CJ's ruling and the country's effort to fight corruption.

In his recently published book, 'Dr. Barnabas Sibusiso Dlamini: Inspiration, the personal journey of the Prime Minister of Swaziland', he said he

was worried about the precedent set in the former minister's case.

The premier said whilst His Majesty had played his role in the fight against corruption by appointing eight judges and assigning two specifically to deal with cases of corruption and similar commercial crimes, this remained a major challenge.

"Nevertheless there remains a further challenge. During the recent attempted prosecution of the former Minister of Commerce, Industry and Trade Gideon Dlamini, the chief justice expressed the view that there was no criminal case to answer. That view maybe well based on what evidence of criminal behaviour was on record. He also said that the anti-corruption legislation is contrary to the provisions of the constitution. This was quite worrying," he wrote.

He wondered if such a ruling was not opening flood gates for future appeals by those convicted under that legislation.

"If his behaviour was not of criminal nature, then what did his dealings amount to? It needed an unequivocal statement on the matter so it could be laid to rest," he said.

Dlamini said as the work of the ACC is independent of all three arms of government, its effectiveness is only visible to the general public once a case gets into court.

"As I have said a few times in this book, this is not happening," he said.

Dlamini stated in his book that his enquiries have revealed that corruption cases were not being taken to court due to a weakness at Judiciary level rather than in the work of the ACC. "The cases are going to the Director of Public Prosecutions but nothing happens after that. We are not mobilising the prosecution process as rapidly as we should be," the premier noted in his book.

Bigger

In fact one of the bigger cases of grand corruption Mngwengwe did is the one involving former Justice and Constitutional Affairs Minister Sen. Sibusiso Shongwe.

The former minister is implicated in the Swaziland Revenue Authority and Impuzi case where over a million Emalangeni is said to have been deposited into his account. It is the arrest of the then minister that triggered the dismissal of the former Chief Justice Michael Ramodibedi.

Hired

Mngwengwe was hired following the two countries, in particular the ministry of justice and constitutional affairs signed with that of the Republic of South Africa, where a Memorandum of Understanding to give the country technical support was reached.

The then Scorpions head, given his experience with corruption cases, was then recommended to head the country's commission after Malawian born Judge Justice Mtegha left.

One of the cases he had dealt with in South Africa involved charging the then South African Deputy President Jacob Zuma with corruption and fraud.

These were the same charges that were later dropped by the former Director of Public Prosecutions (NDDP) Makodedi Mphse which are today haunting Zuma.

When PS in the Ministry of Justice Lorraine Hlophe was contacted on the matter she said the newspaper should forward a questionnaire for the attention of the minister who will be back in office on Monday.

She only confirmed that their MoU with South Africa is still valid and did not want to comment on the expiry of Mngwengwe's contract.

The minister, when tried on his mobile phone, he did not pick it at first and later it was out of the Swazi MTN network.

Victor Murder suspect Sipho Shongwe secretly remanded again

esterday members of the public and those that were attending Magistrate's Courts matters were treated to a spectacle as if from a Hollywood block-buster movie, due to the tight security provided by His Majesty's Correctional Services.

Earlier this week, Shongwe appeared at the High Court before Judge Sipho Nkosi where he made an application to be admitted to bail. However, the crown is reported to have also filed its intention to oppose the granting of bail to Shongwe.

Principal Crown Counsel Absalom Makhanya on Wednesday filed an intention to oppose notice.

High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi ordered that the crown should file its responding papers by Monday, and both the defence and crown file their heads of argument by 12 noon on the same date before the matter is brought back to court for argument on Valentine's Day.

Judge Nkosi also ordered that both counsels file their bundle of authorities with all their papers in order by Wednesday at 9am.

In his bail application, Shongwe submitted that he needs time to consult with his attorney of record Sipho Mnisi and the South African advocate in readiness for his trial, hence the urgency of the application before court.

Phakama's son successfully challenges Observer article

The defendant contended that an ordinary reasonable reader would understand the article to be an account by the defendant's sources of what the late Themba Richard Phakama Dlamini related to them about the plaintiff Muzi Dlamini and their mother Sarah (LaKunene).

The defendant denied further that the article was published wrongfully, recklessly, intentionally and with the sole intention to injure the plaintiff's reputation as a medical practitioner and as a businessman and averred that the articles were published lawfully.

During trial, the plaintiff only led one witness who only happened to be himself and in his testimony he told the court that the article published and complained of was published intentionally or recklessly in order to injure his good name.

This week, the Observer won a law suit against Alpheous Nxumalo who was demanding a sum of E500 000 for an alleged defamatory article.

WE DEMAND JOBS NOW - LUYENGO GRADUATES PETITION M!NISTRY

n a bold move that may see other government ministries being flooded with petitions from graduates from relevant programmes in their departments, yesterday University of Swaziland, Faculty of Agriculture in Luyengo ex-students petitioned the ministry of agriculture where they are demanding employment.

The group of over 50 from different parts of the country was led by Phasika Dlamini, former UNISWA

Student Representative Council President who said they braved the chilly weather and donned their expensive graduation gowns to march on the ministry.

Their petition was received by Bongani Masuku, Principal Secretary, who said he was determined to ensure that the issues contained in the petition were resolved as soon as possible, though he did not give timelines.

The graduates said whereas they wanted to be addressed by Minister Moses Vilakati himself as they had many burning questions and issues, they were hopeful that PS Masuku would not "speak in a forked tongue," that the petition would be considered in their favour.

According to Dlamini, there currently were about 140 unemployed graduates from UNISWA-Luyengo that signed the petition and more would be added, allegedly due to the fact that they were being rejected by the Teaching Service Commission which previously employed them as contract teachers.

"TSC akasasifimi, utsi asisibo bakhe, tsine ke sati kutsi make wetfu litiko letekulima," loosely translated to mean the "TSC has disowned us and we knowthe ministry of agriculture to be the parent ministry for us". One of the graduates, who spoke on condition of anonymity as he feared being victimised should they be considered for employment, said they were made aware of the fact that some employees in the ministry of agriculture were UNISWA education graduates.

The graduate wondered as to how the ministry was employing eductaion graduates while they languished at home without jobs yet they were better placed to be considered - vacant positions.

He said it was very embarrassing that the ministry was failing to absorb UNISWA-Luyengo graduates whereas other ministries were recruiting them annually and even had lists of students from different tertiary institutions who served internships and were eventually hired on a regular basis.

"The ministry needs to explain its recruitment criteria to the nation because it looks like recruitment of staff is riddled with corruption and nepotism," said the graduate.

Sithembiso Mamba, an Animal Science graduate, said he graduated in 2013 and secured employment as a contract teacher with the TSC but unfortunately the contract expired, forcing him to retreat back home as he was no longer earning income.

He said he would love to find a job in the ministry of agriculture, especially as the country is facing many challenges considering the recent ban

on beef imports to the EU. He said it was also an insult to government that they were unemployed yet government invested millions in scholarships towards their education and, therefore, it boggles the mind why the ministry was failing to employ them. On a parting shot, the graduates expressed deep concern about the budget allocated to the ministry as it was counterproductive, they wondered why the budget for security forces ballooned every financial year, yet the most crucial ones diminished."We hope that this year the budget allocation for agriculture will increase as we have noted with deep concern over the years that it was on a steep decline, yet the country is struggling with sustainable food security," he said.

Thobile Nhlabatsi, an Agronomy graduate, said their teaching contracts expired late last year and this year they were told that TSC was no longer engaging them as teachers.

Nhlabatsi said it was for that reason why she decided to join some of her colleagues in the march to deliver the petition. Mbongeni Dlamini from Ludzeludze, said he graduated from UNISWA in 2004 over 13 years ago and has been on and off work as he was only employed as a contract teacher at Mbabane Central High School.

He said the contracts for teaching were not a permanent solution but he was forced to compromise by taking the job offer as nothing from the ministry of agriculture was forthcoming. He pleaded with Minister Vilakati to consider employing them as the country needed them in order to meet the Maputo Declaration on food security. Dlamini said they were made to feel like orphans by the ministry of education but were hopeful that their parent ministry would rescue them from squalor.

Hit by negligent driver or not must be compensated

owever the proposed amendments to this law prescribe that subject to Subsection (1), 'the total liability of the SMVA Fund under Section 10 in respect of a motor vehicle accident caused by the negligence of the driver or owner of a motor vehicle in which a person injured or killed was being conveyed as a passenger: for reward; in the course of the business of the owner or the driver of that motor vehicle; or in the case of an employee of the driver or owner of that motor vehicle, in respect of whom Subsection (6) does not apply, in the course of his employment of that employee, shall not exceed the sum of E300 000 or such other sum as the minister may, in consultation with the board, prescribe, in respect of a claim by an injured party and, the total liability for claims by all claimants shall be limited to the sum of E3.5m irrespective of the number of claimants."

The law further provides that, notwithstanding Subsection (5), where a claim is for a loss of income and support, the said person is to be paid the said claim and shall be paid on a monthly basis R8 000 where such sum has been proved to the satisfaction of the SMVA Fund.

Furthermore wherein the income cannot be proved by the claimant to the satisfaction of the SMVA Fund, the SMVA Fund shall use the industry standard or the informal sector minimum wage of the said deceased as a basis for the calculation of the income support benefit due subject to the total maximum prescribed in this sec-

General damages stand at E300 000

The total liability of the SMVA under Section 10 in respect of general damages shall not exceed the sum of E300 000 per claim, or such other sum as the minister may, in consultation with the board, prescribe.

For loss of support the claim stands at E350 000 maximum in respect of a dependant which shall be paid on a maximum of E8 000 per month depending on the income of the deceased person.

n amendment into the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund calls for an increase of up to E3 500 000 total in claims albeit irrespective of the number of dependants. This is according to the Amendment Bill of 2017 currently being circulated among stakeholders for input. 

Payable

The benefits payable to a driver shall be reduced by 50 per cent where it is proved that the blood alcohol level of such driver exceeded the limit prescribed under the Road Traffic Act, 2007 or its successor, or that he was, at the time of the accident in question, driving under the influence of a drug as defined under the Opium and habit-forming Drugs Act, 1922, or Medicines And related Substances Control Act, 2016, or successors.

The benefits otherwise payable in respect of a person injured or killed in a motor vehicle accident, shall be reduced by 25 per cent, where such was: at the time of the accident not wearing a seat belt fitted to the vehicle for such purpose; or not seated in or on a seat specifically designed for, and affixed permanently to, the

The benefits payable to the driver shall be reduced by 50 per cent where the said driver was in unlawful possession or use of the vehicle or where the vehicle was defective, irrespective of whether or not such possession, use or defect contributed the cause of the vehicle accident in guestion, and the same reduction shall apply to any passenger in the vehicle if it is proved that the passenger had knowledge or ought to have known of such unlawful possession

The minister acting on the advice of the fund and subject to confirmation by Parliament may, by notice publish in the Gazette, adjust the amounts referred to in this section annually, in order to counter the effects of inflation. CJ's statement in effect, senseless murder suspect admitted to E150 000 bail

t seems the recent statement made by the Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala imploring judicial officers to review bail admissions in as far as premeditated murder cases are on the rise in the country has effects, as the man who allegedly senselessly killed his lover's father was yesterday admitted to E150 000 bail by the High Court.

High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi who was in fact reluctant to admit the 78-year-old former Ndzingeni High School principal and now businessman Dumisani Mfana Mkhonta of Mshingishingini to bail as he was concerned in the manner the suspect allegedly committed the offence.

Judge Nkosi wondered how a man of Mkhonta's age would go to another man's homestead, pick up that man's wife and daughter at night in his presence and fur-

Judge Nkosi who even summoned traditional authorities from Ekudwaleni area at Ndzingeni in the Hhohho Region vesterday expressed his shock and dismay on how the deceased Bekithemba Khayile was killed at his own homestead by a man who had come to take his wife and daughter without his consent at night.

Judge Nkosi wondered why Mkhonta did not drive off in his vehicle upon seeing that the deceased was angered by the fact that his wife and daughter were being taken by another man at night without his

Former Ndzingeni principal who shot and killed lover's dad has been ordered to pay E50 000 cash, E100 000 in a form of surety

Murder suspects had been gaining their freedom at E50 000 and only pay between E3 000, E5 000 and E10 000 cash and the rest in the form of surety

The CJ recently made a statement during the official opening of the legal calender to the effect that granting of bail for murder especially premeditated murder which is on the rise should be reviewed by judicial officers.

Judge Nkosi who was reluctant to admit the suspect to bail wondered why Mkhonta went to pick up someone's wife at her marital homestead at night while her husband was even present and further wondered why he was carrying a gun which he eventually used in the murder.

"What was he doing really when he went to pick someone's wife at the deceased's residence further demanding the deceased's daughter, this is totally unSwazi, he even failed to drive off in his car when the deceased fought him away but instead he went for his gun in the car and shot the deceased, I will not give him bail," Judge

It took Pigg's Peak based lawyer Sabelo 'Chicken' Dlamini two days to convince Judge Nkosi that his client (Mkhonta) is entitled to bail as he submitted that he is a sickly person who was also injured during the fatal incident and that he needs medical attention.

The crown represented by Nomkhosi Dlamini was initially opposing the bail application but later changed its attitude.

Judge Nkosi after a lengthy hearing, eventually granted Mkhonta bail which was fixed at the sum of E150 000 with the E50 000 expected to be paid in cash and the rest in a form of a surety.

How I shot and killed deceased -

ccording to Mkhonta in his urgent bail application, he was arrested by the Pigg's Peak Police on January 27, 2018 and was subsequently charged with the murder of Khayile at Ekudwaleni area.

In his affidavit, he submitted that he had gone to the deceased's homestead to pick up and transport the wife and daughter of the deceased to a funeral scheduled for a Sunday.

Mkhonta stated that whilst parked at the deceased's yard waiting for the two to get inside his vehicle, the deceased emerged and immediately attacked him using an iron rod to hit him several times on the head.

"I immediately pulled out my firearm and fired warning shots in the air but the deceased charged at me in anger hence I unintentionally shot directly at him in fear of my life," Mkhonta submitted.

He further stated that to show his remorse he contributed an amount of E19 000 towards the deceased's funeral expenses.

He pleaded with the court to release

him on bail since he is a sickly person and was injured during the fatal incident claiming he needs medical attention. However, Judge Nkosi said this is no problem as the Correctional Services officers can take him to the Mbabane Government Hospital if need be.

By the time this report was compiled yesterday afternoon, Mkhonta was still in custody as his relatives were seen having a meeting outside the court immediately after he was granted bail obviously looking into ways of raising the E50 000.

(a) The removal of the disparity between claimants;

(b) Increasing the overall limits and liability of the SMVAF and introduction of new categories;

To review the benefit limits set out under Section 10 and Section 11 of the Act; (c)

To ensure the benefits are determined on the basis of individual claims submitted rather than on aggregate (d)

In undertaking the review, the Fund remains as a fault based compensation scheme except for funeral benefit:. (e)

espite being a model for stability in the region, Ghana, together with another six African countries, has significantly declined.

The rampant corruption in Ghana led citizens to voice their frustrations through the election, resulting in an incumbent president losing for the first time in Ghana's history.

Some other large African countries have failed to improve their scores on the index by a statistically significant amount.

These include South Africa, Nigeria, Tanzania and Kenya. South African President Jacob Zuma was in court and in the media for corruption scandals.

This included his own appeal against findings in a report by then Public Prosecutor Thuli Madonsela, regarding undue public spending in his private homestead in Nkandla.

Kenya - despite the adoption of a few anticorruption measures including passing a law on the right to information - has a long way to go. President Uhuru expressed frustration that all his anti-corruption efforts were not yielding much.

He may need new strategies as Kenyan citizens go to the polls in 2017.

Right at the bottom of the list is Somalia, whose parliamentary elections were marred by malpractice and corruption, and whose presidential elections were postponed three times last year and are yet to be held.

We have defined Corruption as "dishonest or fraudulent conduct by those in power, typically involving bribery."

KING MOURNS TAIWAN **EARTQUAKE TRAGEDY**

is Majesty King Mswati III has joined the world in mourning the tragedy that has befallen the people of the Republic of China on Taiwan in the form of a devastating earthquake that took place in that country this week.

Through a statement by Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini, the King relayed a message of sympathy to President Tsai Ing Wen, the Taiwan government and people of that country following the devastating earthquake, which has claimed lives and caused massive destruction.

It was reported this week that at least nine people were killed and 270 injured when the magnitude 6.4 quake struck late on Tuesday 22 kilometres (13 miles) north of the city of Hualien.

It also damaged bridges and buckled roads in and around Hualien, a city on the island's northeastern shores.

A magnitude 5.7 earthquake further shook the already devastated tourist town in the early hours of Thursday.

Eight people were still unaccounted for in

Hualien on Thursday afternoon, all of whom were believed to have been living or temporarily staying at the now badly damaged and tilting Yun Men Tsui Ti building, officials said.

"I have it in command by His Majesty, King Mswati III, Her Majesty the Queen Mother, and on behalf of the government and the Kingdom of Swaziland, as well as on my own, to express our sincere heartfelt grief and deepest sympathy on learning about the recent devastating earthquake at Hualien City, Taiwan, which claimed many lives, massive destruction of buildings and properties, displacement of people and disruption of family ties.

It is our fervent hope and prayer that the Almighty God will comfort the president, relatives and friends of the Government and the people of the Republic of China (Taiwan) during this hour of bereavement and give the nation the strength needed to rebuild," read the statement.

The statement further pleadged that the country's ministry of foreign affairs and international cooprtation avails itself of the opportunity to renew to the Taiwanese the assurances of its highest consideration.

Lawyers make the final push but say nothing moves

ttorneys SM Kubheka filed a notice of motion at the High Court on 22 September 2017 "revoking the appointment of Amos Matimakhulu as both curator ad litem and curator bonis for his late brother's child, Moses Wonder Mahumane which was granted on 8th March, 2013."

This was accompanied by a confirmatory affidavit by the child's mother Nomie who wrote "I confirm that I the mother of Moses Wonder Mahumane who is under my custody and my guardianship, the Mother Vehicle Accident Fund has informed me that it would feel more comfortable if the claim for the loss of support for the aforesaid child arising out of the death of his father was pursued by myself in per-

It was in the strength of same that the court ruled that "having heard counsel for the applicant, an order is hereby granted; revoking the appointment of the applicant Amos Matimakhulu as both curator ad litem and curator bonis for his late brother's child, Moses Wonder Mahumane which was granted in terms of the above Honourable Court's Order of the 8th March,

Mother screams for rights of her orphan

omie says she can hardly send her hand under the nose because of poverty with jobs being hard to come by

The little she had been able to gather over the years she has been struggling to send home where the child lives with her parents to at least help him acquire some education.

But this has not been enough because the expectations that his money would one day be released by MVA had kept hitting snag to this very date despite a court order issued last September, nearly half a school calendar year ago.

Promised

"I took the court order to MVA where they promised to call me but nothing has materialised until now and it would not be long before they send my child home due to fees outstanding.

I have a serious challenge in raising the money for my son and this becomes heartbreakingly sad when one knows that my child's money is being kept somewhere for reasons unknown to us even after the courts had ruled in his favour.

To think of how tragically his father died and now his funds are locked somewhere, it is double jeopardy not only to me but to

At least let them pay the fees and then do the process of the other stuff whatever it is just so the child can enjoy growing up and going to school like the other children in this country."

STILL NO MVA FOR 2002 FATAL CRASH, CHILD TO BE KICKED OUT OF SCHOOL

...But MVA not to blame for delays, already processing claim after complete documentation was only submitted recently

fter waiting for nearly two decades for the release of compensation moneys due him following the fatal crashing of his father's car on Jika Majika bus near Riders Ranch back in 2002, an orphan beneficiary is failing to pay fees for his high school education despite that his father was covered by the Motor Vehicle Accident Fund. Already there is a court order in favour of Nomie Nombulelo Mndzebele, the mother of the child, issued High Court Judge Titus Mlangeni clearing all other impediments that were cited as responsible for the withholding of the moneys from the beneficiary.

However MVA Corporate Communications Manager Makhoselangeni Magongo says "kindly be advised that the fund recently received a copy of the court order from the claimant. Our claims department is finalising the matter and will be contacting the claimant soon."

The brother to the deceased Amos Matimakhulu has since been removed as curator ad litem and curator bonis for his late brother's child which had been granted in terms of an order of the High Court dated 8 March 2013. The deceased left children of different mothers who all had interest in the estate including Amos in his capacity as the senior

In all there were four minors, the deceased sired two minors from same woman and the others each with a separate mother. The mother of the two children is Emilia Albino Sumbi. Nomie Mndzebele is the mother of this one afflicted survivor whose moneys at issue with the MVA.

Notably Matimakhulu had earlier agreed to delete his name as the curator letting the mothers to proceed with the claim. Mndzebele from Swaziland has also submitted written proofs that she is the surviving parent to look after the rights of the child including his share of the MVA claim.

She filed such papers in April last

year in what she thought was the last of her missiles in the battle to have moneys due to her children for their education released.

In lieu of a background in October 2004 the MVA asked all the interested parties in the claim through lawyers SM Kubheka & Associates that "without admitting liability on the merits but solely for purposes of expediting settlement of the claim

mit the much needed papers with MVA together with costs of burial and other paraphernalia. However the claim got complicated until Matimakhulu filed affidavits to the court to which he obtained an order as in 2010 that " the applicant A m o s



The applicant is hereby appointed curator lad litem for the purposes of prosecuting a claim for compensation on behalf of the said children.

The applicant is hereby authorised to open a trust account for the four minor children, which such account shall be administered by the applicant and Mr Sibusiso Kubheka, who is the practicing attorney, together with any other person that may be deemed fit and proper by the applicant, as joint trustees." Kubheka closed shop even before this court order was implemented until Matimakhulu withdrew as the cura-

On 15 October, 2012 things began to move when Matimakhulu attached the child heath card of Tomas Frede Mohomane, one of the children bom on 21 March, 2000 together with an affidavit signed by Nomie Nombulelo Mndzebele, the mother of the youngest child Moses Wonder Mahomane born 19 June, 2002 in which he wrote "I am the only surviving brother to one Frederico Mahomane, born on the 13th March 1971, who died on the 25th August 2002, in a motor vehicle accident at Sidvokodvo, in the Manzini region. I respectfully refer to a copy of the death certificate annexed hereto.

The deceased is survived by the following children, both of whom

On-call allowance standardisation matter postponed

esterday nurses and other healthcare workers returned home dejected after their matter that was due to be heard at the Industrial Court before Judge Nkosinathi Nkonyane, was ultimately postponed to April 9 2018.

According to an address outside the Industrial Court by SWADNU Secretary General, Sibusiso Lushaba, the process that had culminated in the circular began as far back 2016.

He said they learnt from government that it was going to review the terms and conditions of their membership's on-call allowances. He said during year 2017 they were tempted to interdict the government but the union was advised against that.

He was on to allege that the employer had developed a habit of non consultation when it came to crucial decisions that affected one's remuneration.

Lushaba emphasised that the issue of on call allowances did not only affect nurses but it was one that affected all healthcare workers and therefore he implored all members to be united against their common enemy which was their employer.

He said that while it was true that we lived in a country that preaches individualism he said it was the essence of member's survival to always be united.

Reasons

While the reasons for the postponement were not readily spelt out, however the nurses were unhappy by what the union termed as an unnecessary delay.

Earlier media reports suggested that Circular No.1 of 2018 of On-Call Allowance standardisation in the ministry of health was declared discriminatory by the president of the Swaziland Democratic Nurses Union (SWADNU), Bheki Mamba when a petition to the ministry of health was being delivered on the February 1.

Mamba said they wanted the on-call allowances to cut across as the money would not be the same because of their varying salary grades. He said if government wanted to compensate other people, they should have done it through grading and not allowances.

The union members had converged at the park adjacent to the Mbabane Fire Station on that day where they were taking orders before eventually marching. Mamba told the union members that it was only fair to be paid according to the hours they put in and wanted to know what scientific method was used by government to come up with the allowances in the circular.

Unite

He encouraged government to be open to the negotiating table. The president advised the health workers to unite and fight the 'monster', referring to government.

"Don't you dare come to a conclusion that when this monster calls you they will then do you a favour because it will never happen as the monster is all out to divide and push health workers out," he said

Mamba said they had come to deliver the petition to the ministry of health to encourage it to review the circular.

t has been 25 years since the Komati Basin Water Authority (KOBWA) that gave birth to the Maguga Dam at Nkomanzi in the iry's Northern Hhohho region and the Driekor, ies Dam in the Mpumalanga Province of South Africa was established.

Minister of Natural Resources and Energy Jabulile Mashwama and her South African counterpart in Minister of Water and Sanitation Nomvula Mokonyane will, therefore, join KOBWA in commemorating its 25 years of existence in an event slated for February 27 at Emnotfweni in the Mpumalanga Province.

The theme for the anniversary is: "Celebrating 25 Years in Excellent Transboundary Water Management" and KOBWA will engage principals from the party states, stakeholders in the industry, employees and the general public. Invitees will include Joint Water Commission

members (current and past), board of directors (current and past); former KOBWA managers, executives from the Department of Water and Sanitations and from the Department of Water Affairs.

Concept

According to the event's concept note, the objectives of commemorative events are to highlight KOBWA's achievements and challenges in the past twenty-five years; to provoke dialogue around issues of integrated water resource management by stakeholders and chart a way forward: to enhance communities' understanding of KOBWA's role in the Basin; and to focus KOBWA relevance in the Komati Basin. KOBWA's present and future role in the Komati will be highlighted.

"As a build-up to the main event, the communities that border the dams have been engaged through soccer tournaments as a build-up to the main event. As part of the Corporate Social Initiative (CSI), shoes will be presented to needy learners in primary schools that are within KOBWA's area of operation," reads part of the concept note.

Meanwhile, KOBWA was established in 1992 through the Komati Basin Treaty that was signed by the governments of South Africa and Swaziland. This agreement mandated KOBWA with designing and constructing the Driekoppies and the Maguga Dams as well as operating and maintaining the project. The result was the construction of the Driekoppies Dam in 19 3 and the Maguga Dam in 1998. Currently, KO 'A is at the operation and maintenance phase.

For the organisation, this is an opportunity to reflect on successes, challenges and also chart a way forward for the organisation. The aim is to promote KOBWA as a force to be reckoned with in the water industry locally and internationally.





POLICE ILLEGALLY OCCUPY ROA

oyal Swaziland Police are at the centre of a controversy surrounding the occupation of a road reserve where they are operating a satellite post near Mahhala Shopping Complex in Matsapha.

This is because police are said to have claimed that they were given the land by the Matsapha Town Board, an entity that has no jurisdiction over that piece of land.

Matsapha Town Board minutes of November 21, 2017, the inaugural meeting of the present council reflect under the category 'land allocation for the Mahhala Police Post' that the "town clerk confirmed that the pegs for the site of the police post were raised by the Surveyor General's Office, and it was confirmed that the police post was situated outside the Matsapha urban boundaries, i.e. on the road reserve. The town clerk confirmed that the Minute had been transmitted to the ministry of housing and urban development." However, Surveyor

all stakeholders that include the owner of the shopping complex Tommy Kirk the Matsapha Municipal Council, the ministry of public works and trans. port and that of natural resources However, Kirk considers this as a mere talk show because police had been saying the same thing for umpteenth time now and of particular if irrelevance is the mention of Matsapha Town Board, the municipality, which has no jurisdiction whatsoever over that property. To crown it all, Kirk has built a permanent facility for the police to use as the post, complete with ablutions, but the police insist on setting up shop in the open arena where they are often blamed for disrupting free flow of traffic and causing accidents instead of providing the peace.

The positioning of the police post is such that the road leading to it departs from the only three-metre lane that is the only access from the huge complex to the national highway at the flyover, thus causing even more congestions. Mahhala Shopping Complex is the only establishment of its

irk's other headache is the ever growing congestion further exacerbated by the presence of the police given that he only has a three-metre wide access road to accommodate all traffic coming out of the complex to join the highway.

Those going to the police post link to this narrow access road which must also accommodate trucks leaving the complex together with other traffic, including the pedestrian traffic. Last Sunday, there were two near fatal accidents at the entrance while last week a vehicle nearly knocked down fuel pumps at the filling station.

The other issue at hand is the development of a property by the Matsapha Town Board that was to be a utility park to accommodate, among other utilities, a bus rank and markets. This is the area that the town board would have had a jurisdiction. On February 2013, Matsapha Town Board had published an invitation of expression of interest for development partners for the development of the Matsapha bus rank and main market through Public Private Partnership (PPP) arrange-

The Board invited Expression of Interest (EOI) from reputable and experienced project development companies and investors either as individual firm or consortium with the requisite capabilities to submit proposals to participate in the competitive tender for the development of the site into a convenient public facility.

The envisioned PPP procurement was a design, build, finance, operate and transfer (DBFOT) model. The requirements for the execution of the project would include but not limited to:- Review and update the existing bus rank and main market concept plan; Undertake the requisite engineering designs for the development.

It should be noted that all designs were to be carried out based on acceptable cost effective technical design principles and performance criteria/standards; Prepare a schedule of project cost and bill of quan-The Board was seeking partners tities; Responsible for the financation and maintenance of the faciltices against mutually established benchmarks of performance during the envisaged concession period; and, Ensure compliance with all statutory requirements and relevant procedures of the Matsapha Town Board. The terms 'public street' and 'public road' are defined thus in (s) one of the By Law and again in item one of the DMS: 'public street' - 'any land indicated on an approved general plan, diagram or map as having been set aside as a public right of way, whether for vehicles or pedestrians or public or urban squares, of which ownership is registered in favour of or vests in 'ty in terms of this By-Law or



any other law;' 4 'public road' - 'any highway, thoroughfare, lane, footpath, sidewalk, alley, passage, bridge or any other place of a similar nature or any portion thereof serving as a public right of way, whether for vehicles or pedestrians, established or proclaimed in terms of the former Municipal Ordinance, 1974 (Ordinance 20 of 1974) or any equivalent current municipal bylaw and/or national legislation and includes a public street'.



authorisation on land outside its jurisdiction?" Kirk further says, referring to Tuesday evening's radio broadcast featuring Magagula, if he reconsiders that the post built by him is now nice, why does he not occupy it.

He further says even when the police were still operating within the Mahhala complex they left without even bidding goodbye, bangakavalelisi. "I don't know how many times they are coming back to talk to me. I cannot meet Town Board about land that is outside their jurisdiction."

The post, says Kirk, is at an accident prone area with no basic amenities such as toilets.

The only available amenities

are those provided by at the complex which both police and members of the public may use or else make do with the bushes on the banks of the Lusushwana River further down the estate.

The mobile cubicle that is the police post is somewhat an improvement from a makeshift military tent that had been used for quite some time to serve the public as a police post.

As Parliament opens next week, talk is already abound that police would request an increased budget from MP's to include the construction of a police post or station at Mahhala.

The Matsapha Police Station is further up the Matsapha industrial estate near Mashayitafula where there is hardly any activity as compared to Mahhala where it was originally planned that the station would be situat-

olice Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba says the situation has been exacerbated by the interest of the media to the effect that National Commissioner Isaac Magagula has called for a stakeholders' meeting where the matter will be put to rest.

Amandla Financial Services client evicted from his property

client who failed to honour his obligations in paying a financial services provider has lost his property as the High Court has ordered that he be evicted in respect of monies owed to the financial services provider.

The High Court has ordered that Selby Solwako Maseko and all those who hold title and occupy Lot No. 2887 situate in Mbabane Extension 11 at Thembelinhle Township, be evicted forthwith following an application that was filed by Amandla Financial Services.

High Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze also ordered that the national commissioner of police should forthwith assist in the enforcement of the eviction.

Amandla filed an application before the High Court which emanates from a judgment it obtained against Maseko, who was cited as the first respondent on December 2016 for payment of the sum of E720 758.56 with interest and costs there-

The 2016 judgment further declared the property, which is the subject matter of the litigation, to be executable.

Judgment

According to a judgment handed down by Judge Fakudze yesterday, Amandla lent and advanced to the first respondent (Maseko) a sum of E718 033.57 in 2015 and the loan was to be used by Maseko to complete his block of flats.

According to the agreement, the loan was to be payable in 24 months and security for the loan was to register a mortgage bond No. 220 of 2015 in Mbabane in favour of the applicant held under deed transfer 488 of

In terms of the bond and in the event the respondent failed to make punctual payments of interests and other sums due, it called upon the respondue, owing and payable under the purchaser. the bland must further origin to my houses pondent and all

such an order of court was obtained against him.

Pursuant to the order and a writ of execution for attachment of the property, a notice of sale of the property by public auction was published. which sale was to be conducted on March 24 2017. On the date of sale in execution, one Joseph Ndlangamandla cited as the second applicant, was the successful bidder and purchaser of the property on behalf of SAJO Family Trust.

Subsequent to the successful bidding, SAJO approached its financier in order to obtain finance for the purchase of the immovable property and the financier requested that a valuation of the property be carried out prior to the approval of the finance being granted for the purchase of the property thereof.

Ndlangamandla further applied that Maseko and all who hold title and occupy the property at Thembelinhle Township be evicted and that he be granted free and unhindered access to the property as the new owner.

However, following the successful sale, Maseko contended that there was no compliance, particularly with respect to the effect that within 14 days of sale, the balance against transfer must be secured by a bank or building society to be approved by the plaintiff's attorneys and to be furnished to the Deputy Sheriff arguing that since there was no compliance the sale should be nullified by the court.

Maseko further contended that the auction sale took place on March 24, 2017 and the application seeking access to the disputed property was dated April 28 and set down for hearing on May 12. He argued that in terms of the law, a Deputy Sherriff should be an executive of the law not an agent of any party to an auction sale.

When handing down judgment, Judge Fakudze stated that the court holds the view that since the Deputy Sheriff did not report that any condition had not been met so as to cause a judge to cancel the sale, he was obliged to assist the purchaser in accessing the property for purposes of the evaluation and further he was expected to assist in the registration of dent to pay forthwith all sums the property in the name of





STUDY: SD has poor quality of life, environmentally unfriendly

waziland has been listed as the worst country which has failed to provide a good quality of life and to achieve environmental targets.

It is impossible for humans to live both a 'good' life and an environmentally friendly one, researchers have found.

Scientists compared the ability of countries to meet 11 social goals for their citizens against how they measured up to seven environmental targets.

According to MailOnline, the study found that no country has managed to achieve the right balance between happiness and sustainability, and that the better a country does on one side of the scale, the worse it tends to do on the other.

Of all 151 nations studied, Vietnam came closest to achieving balance, hiting seven of 11 social goals while only exceeding one environmental limit on CO2 emissions.

Three nations - Austria, Germany and the Netherlands - maxed out the social targets, but fell way behind when it came to the environmental goals.

Scientists compared the ability of countries to meet 11 social goals for their citizens against how they measured up to seven environmental targets

Meanwhile, Afghanistan, Burundi, and Eritrea were among 16 countries to pass every environmental test, but failed miserably when it came to providing for their people.

The worst country on either lists was Swaziland, which failed both to provide a good quality of life and to hit environmental targets.

Social goals identified by researchers included earning more than US\$1.90 (about E23) per day, access to energy, access to food, and employment.

Targets

Meanwhile, environmental targets included water usage, carbon emissions and whether land was being used in a sustainable way.

In terms of social goals, the UK was among the best-ranked, hitting eight out of 11 targets and missing out on two by small margins. The United States achieved nine, as did Australia.

But the UK busts on five out of seven environmental measures, getting passing grades only in land usage and water

America misses all environmental targets - including having CO2 emissions at 13 times sustainable rates - and Australia breaches six.

The study was carried out by the Sustainability Research Institute at University of Leeds in England and the Mercator Research Institute on Global Commons and Climate Change in Berlin.

Co-author Dr Julia Steinberger, from the School of Earth and Environment at Leeds, said: "Radical changes are needed if all people are to live well within the limits of the planet.

"These include moving beyond the pursuit of economic growth in wealthy nations, shifting rapidly from fossil fuels to renewable energy, and significantly reducing inequality.'

JA throws lifeline to young learners

upils have been thrown a lifeline by Junior Achievement Swaziland as they will henceforth determine their financial providence through being their own

This is because JA Swaziland has entrusted those pupils in Form Two specifically to run a co-operative society in 40 secondary schools where the company has presence.

JA Swaziland Executive Director Siboniso Madlopha said this partnership has been made possible by their working relationship with Swazi MTN, ministry of education and training as well as that of commerce industry and trade.

The pupils will elect their own executive/management committee to be housed in Form Two at the respective schools but all the pupils where JA Swaziland operates are encouraged to be mem-

This is meant to encourage the pupils to save and invest extra cash in the form of pocket or lunch money rather than spending everything received from their parents.

The co-operative to administer the money raised by the pupils at their respective schools is Lubane Savings and Credit Co-operative Society, which has been in existence for over 40 years now.

"We are in advanced talks with Lubane and everything has been finalised; just that we need to sign a memorandum of understanding (MoU) to formalise the agreement," he stated.

He said the pupils will be given monthly statements and thereafter quarterly ones before being invited to the AGM of their respective co-operative society.

Their teachers have been trained on how to assist the pupils manage the co-operative while means are underway to engage head teachers.

"A short while ago we engaged teachers and I can tell you now that the excitement amongst them is unbelievable.

"We would have an AGM and elect new office bearers each year for the co-operative because we want the organisation to be administered by Form Two pupils.

"The advantage is that pupils can become a member of the co-operative beyond their schooling days as we are trying to inculcate the culture of saving amongst them at their young ages," the JA executive director said.

JA Swaziland operates in 40 secondary and high schools with the majority of these (65 per cent) based in rural areas.

After saving the pocket money, the pupils will hand it over to their teachers who in turn will send it to Lubane Savings and Credit Cooperative Society via MTN Mobile Money platform same day to avoid funds not being accounted for.

"We will teach the pupils on how to track their money, interpret their statements and be financially independent. They could later in life use their savings for paying their tertiary education, purchasing that dream home or car, alternatively use it as collateral for loans as we work towards financial inclusion," Madlopha closed.

Dividends of the funds invested by the pupils can be re-invested into the co-operative society or be claimed by the pupils yearly together with interest accruing from sav-

There will be no administrative costs to be borne by the pupils for running the co-operative society as these will be catered for by

Swazi ex-miners could get E105 000 compensation in SA

wazi ex-miners, who worked in the South African mines and contracted silicosis and tuberculosis (TB), could get up to E105 000 as compensation for their illnesses, according to that country's Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Act.

The out of court settlement for the tuberculosis and silicosis class action brought against six gold mining companies on the Witwatersrand could be signed in the next six months, Graham Briggs, the convener of the Occupational Lung Diseases Working Group, said this week.

Briggs told journalists on the sidelines of the Investing in Africa Mining Indaba in Cape Town that lawyers for the mines and the former mine workers were close to signing the settle-

According to Business Report, mining companies set aside E5 billion towards compensation in November for thousands of miners who contracted



TB and silicosis, a lung disease caused by the inhalation of dust containing silica, as of 1965.

Briggs said compensation for the first-degree silicosis was E45 000. according to the Occupational Diseases in Mines and Works Act, while compensation for secondary silicosis was pegged at E105 000.

Compensation for occupational TB

is a lower number, he said.

"We will hopefully get the settlement signed in six months," said Briggs, adding that this was a move to solve a 100-year-old problem.

Top-up

The E5bn was a 'top-up' to the E3.5bn compensation set aside by the gover 'ent through the Department of to pay former mine workers

who contracted silicosis in gold mines.

It has been reported that nearly halfa-million miners who contracted silicosis and tuberculosis are from neighbouring countries that supplied labour to South African mines.

In 2016, lawyers - including Richard Spoor and Charles Abrahams - brought the class action against Harmony Gold Mining, Gold Fields, AngloGold

Ashanti, African Rainbow Minerals, Anglo American South Africa and Sibanye-Stillwater for employees who contracted TB and silicosis.

Gold mining companies came together and established the Mining Industry Working Group on Occupational Lung Diseases to handle the matter.

Briggs, a former chief executive of Harmony Gold, said the Chamber of Mines had spent a lot of money tracing beneficiaries through outreaches to villages in the Eastern Cape, Swaziland and Lesotho.

"Although you have records, you do not know where they live. People in rural areas are generally poor in terms of infrastructure.

"They do not have bank accounts. If it was not a problem, people would have received their money long ago," said Briggs.

In January, lawyers from both parties postponed the court case and put in a provisional R5bn settlement following negotiations.

70-year-old HIV positive living in squalor

The 70-year-old HIV positive and tuberculosis (TB) patient is appealing for assistance for food and a decent house after he was abandoned by his young wife. The elderly man of Lushikishini is living in fear of his own house falling over and killing him instantly.

He is appealing for assistance in rehabilitating his falling house before it kills him in his sleep. The house, made of mud bricks, which is a common building material in the area, is dilapidated and about to fall apart much as another house in the same yard is falling over.

The treacherous trek to find the elderly man was rather challenging for a news investigative team, through densely overgrown grass that seemed to stifle trees that dared to flourish. The houses resemble an abandoned home yet the elderly man is alive, old and unable to help himself.

The home has an abandoned thatched rondavel that is falling apart; another jouse with the iron sheet roofing is what the elderly man is currently using but it is equally hazardous to his life.

The falling room is full of heavy stones on the roof, to protect it from being blown by heavy winds and he sets his containers to catch rainwater for domestic use. He uses this water for drinking, bathing and washing.

"Yes, I do the washing. Although I'm old and weak I know my way

around the yard and still carry out my daily domestic chores. I gather firewood and am able to boil water for bathing as well as keeping myself warm at night," he adds.

There is no electricity, and what seems to be the kitchen area is a rickety wooden structure attached to a section of the house with three stones, lots of ashes and wood for a fireside, as well as black pots and pans through which meals were at times prepared.

He further disclosed that his wife left him years ago before returning to take the only boy he thought was his son. The elderly man said he was later taken aback when he was told that the boy was not his son but has his own father, a man he knows but did not even suspect was the father of the boy he called son. He said he was told the son was taken to be with his mother because he was sick but later gathered from other people that the boy was with

another father.

The senior citizen heaped praises on the Mbuyisa family neighbours, disclosing that he has been very sickly for the past two years and throughout his ordeal he has been nursed by his neighbours. The neighbour, Nokuthula Mtsetfwa, ensures he has something to eat daily.

He said his life was in a predicament, sengaba ngizini khamisa (I'm fed like a child), surviving sickness without food, life is impossible. UlaMtsetfwa ungivuse ekufeni, boMbuyisa ngiphila ngenca yabo mfana wami loosely translated "LaMtsetfwa nursed me from the dead and I owe my life to the Mbuyisa family."

Mdluli said he felt terrible for being powerless to change his (mis)fortunes around, rescuing himself from the dungeons of sickness is miracle enhanced by the Mbuyisa family and now the falling house can be one dangerous obstacle.

Neighbour LaMtsetfwa checks on the elderly man and helps out regularly but says she is worried of seeing him living in these less-than-ideal conditions.

"The old man is sick, he needs a decent and conducive house to live in given his condition. He doesn't have an ideal house as this structure could crumble anytime. If that can happen

at night we will never be able to even help him because he cannot call out for rescue considering his old age," adds LaMtsetfwa.

LaMtsetfwa when narrating the history of the elderly Mdluli said "We found the elderly man living alone, he was said to have been living with his son. We noticed he was sickly, goes without food for days and he was very weak".

LaMtsetfwa said they realised that he was on ART yet he was taking medication on an empty stomach and it was taking its toll because he was becoming weak and sick due to malnutrition. She further disclosed that as a family they are new in the area and when they discovered all they could do was try the simple remedy of giving him food and allowed him to recover. LaMtsetfwa said he indeed recovered and now they were glad he was able to even plough his fields hoping for a bumper harvest. "However, we are equally worried about the state of his house as it can fall on him anytime". LaMtsetfwa said for food they share the little they have with him noting that decent shelter is an urgent necessity for the elderly man.

"We would also appeal on his behalf for anyone who could help in rehabilitating his house so he can have a decent dwelling. We can appreciate food as well but the priority is on the house as we are still sharing the little food we have at the moment," adds LaMtsetfwa.

AGOA here but no smoke shooting to the skies at Industrial Sites

atsapha, the industrial hub of Swaziland is not showing any signs of activity despite the re-admission of Swaziland to benefit from the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA).

The factories that were closed down remain closed as a result of Swaziland's removal from AGOA as of January 2015. One of the bigger factories remains closed and has now turned into storage for other commodities being sent to Republic of South Africa and other destination.

Reliable sources at the Tuntex textile opposite Logico Logistics Company in Matsapha said there are no signs of the textile factory reopening. The sources further disclosed that the factory is now full of equipment for packaging and storage for commodities.

Whilst the hype of AGOA was met with excitement in other quarters, in Matsapha industrial site the closed factories are not being reopened. Many factories are not advertising at the main gates as per the norm when vacancies are available. The government strategies for opening textile factories by the esteemed investors seem to be slow than the swift closure of textile factories when the country was removed from AGOA. Textile companies pressured government to comply and pay the duties levied by the United States of America (USA).

Some of the group of textile factories pressured the government and confirmed that they were indeed closing down unless government is will-

African Growth and Opportunity Act

GOA is a United States preferential trade programme established in May 2000 that provides duty-free access to the \$3 trillion (about E33 trillion) American market for thousands of products from eligible sub-Saharan African countries.

One goal of AGOA is to support sub-Saharan African economic development through trade and investment. The programme offers tangible incentives to sub-Saharan African countries for undertaking difficult political and economic reforms that promote long-term growth and development.

Swaziland began benefiting from the programme in 2001 when government voluntarily accepted the AGOA eligibility criteria, which includes respect for the rule of law, poverty reduction, combating corruption, respect for workers' rights and human rights, child labour protection and market openness. Swaziland's loss of AGOA benefits restricted possibilities for diversifying agro-food sector exports, eventual removed after the 2015 review of the AGOA scheme as it introduced some changes suggested in the Brookings Institution report.

After an extensive review, including through a US Trade Representativeled interagency trip in April, the United States government concluded that Swaziland had not demonstrated progress on the protection of internationally recognised worker rights.

In particular, Swaziland was said to have failed to make continual progress in protecting freedom of association and the right to organise.

Of particular concern was the country's use of security forces and arbitrary arrests to stifle peaceful demonstrations, as well as the lack of legal recognition for labour and employer federations.

ing to pay the duties levied by the United States on exports that do not benefit from the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA).

Following the readmission of the country in AGOA, Observer on Saturday visited some of the factories. Many of the factories that were closed remain closed and show no sign of reopening. Some of them that remained operational are not advertising for new

vacancies to show signs of a new era in the textile industry with the AGOA status.

Amalgamated Trade Unions of Swaziland (ATUSWA) Secretary General Wonder Mkhonza said so far there were no meaningful activities at the Matsapha industrial site or in the textile industry in the country at the moment.

He further disclosed that the excite-

ment that was shown in January was not meaningful in terms of substantial employment opportunities for the many unemployed former employees and new people in the textile industry.

Mkhonta confided to the Observer on Saturday that any meaningful employment will be based on the factories getting orders from the American market and that will then translate to the number of people to be employed by the industry once the market is secured with orders.

Observer on Saturday also wanted to know if there are possibilities for Swazis to own some of the factories as it was reported towards the frantic efforts to serve AGOA.

The secretary general confirmed plans by the union to pursue the opportunity but said for such to happen the membership needs to give the union a mandate to pursue such business ambition. "It's a call that needs the blessing of the membership and then the union can then pursue the investment opportunities in the textile industry," adds Mkhonta.

The closures of companies in Matsapha brought sadness in many people who benefited from the employment opportunities that were brought along with the country's AGOA status.

Mkhonza at that time also reported to have said the union met with the directors of a major textile company, where it was confirmed that they would be closing down.

Mkhonza further said the companies said the only way they could continue operating in Swaziland was if government could commit to taking over the payment of export duties they would now be compelled to pay as of the beginning of next year.

He said at that time the companies were not even willing to bear half the cost as they would be operating at losses if they did. "They say it's 'all or nothing'. If government refuses to bear the cost of exporting outside of AGOA then they are definitely closing shop," he said.

Mkhonza said there was also suspicion that the textile companies were being bullied (from certain quarters) into not announcing their intentions even though some of them have already made up their minds.


"At the end of the day, these companies are here to make money and if there's none fortcoming then they have no obligation to stay. The situation is really gloomy and all we can do is hope our government realises the seriousness of the matter," he said.

The secretary general said it was really heart-wrenching when they spoke to the workers who would be affected by the closure of these companies. He said, for instance, the terminal benefits they would receive were just too paltry for survival.

"The benefits being calculated for them are just meagre to even survive for two months. For those of us close to the situation on the ground it's really painful.

Honestly, those who are far removed from the situation are happy because they don't have to witness the misery that has become characteristic at the textile companies," he added.

RESTORATIVE JUSTICE - AN EFFECTIVE PRACTICE TOWARDS OFFENDER REHABILITATION

by any individual in society is not only tantamount to breaking the law but generally causes harm to communities, promotes social disorder while also perpetuating a disintegration in the moral fibre.

While those responsible for committing these crimes (offenders) are sent to correctional centres to serve their sentences, often times victims are left to deal with the effects of such hideous acts while also finding remedy on the lengthy custodial sentences that are a form of admonishment.

Programmes

As families remain torn apart as a result of these criminal activities, His Majesty's Correctional Services strives to find amicable solutions and possible remedy for all parties in order to prevent the commission of crime by same individuals. These efforts include the incorporation of restorative justice as one of the effective forms and or practices towards the rehabilitation of offenders.

The department provides a litany of programmes which are aimed at ensuring such transformation for those who are incarcerated in the various correctional centres.

Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase, cognisant of the repercussions that crime holds against society and the escalating number of offenders in local correctional centres, introduced various developmental programmes. These include education, social work services, psychological services and chaplaincy. He continued to strengthen these units by deploying officers with expertise in the various disciplines.

Though these programmes are equally important as they all play a significant role in transforming the lives of offenders; Ntshangase acknowledges the importance of divine intervention in the work of corrections. While restorative justice focuses on repairing the harm caused by offenders and reducing future impairment through crime prevention, he says such requires offenders to take responsibility for their actions first.

To this end, Ntshangase introduced chaplains in the various correctional centres who would help in catering for the spiritual needs for both officers and offenders. Offenders ought to find peace within their hearts by asking for God's forgiveness and turning their lives to the Creator of Life,

which provides a suitable platform for the treatment programmes to be meted out effectively, hence it was imperative to strengthen spiritual services within the department.

Today, about 60 offenders who have since repented and given their lives to God and will be baptised at Matsapha Correctional Centre.

Baptism

The water baptism which will be conducted by the Seventh Day Adventist Church will include offenders from both the medium and maximum sections, who despite their mistakes, have chosen to lead a pure life.

Upon repentance, the offenders went under baptism lessons and were educated about the Christian life in general. These lessons have also helped the offenders to have a better understanding about the Word of God.

The commissioner general says these offenders who will be baptised today have taken the right decision which will not only be beneficial to themselves but also to other fellow offenders. He said inmates who have been enlightened play a pivotal role in preaching to their colleagues while also sharing similar experiences.

Others who have undergone training in Bible studies are further afforded the opportunity to preach within correctional centres and community churches upon invitation. Ntshangase explained that this has over the years proved to be effective as the offenders have the opportunity to express remorse for their actions while also

being given the opportunity to show society; their positive lifestyle.

He further applauded society for giving offenders a second chance as it has been observed in the past. Ntshangase said the abilitation and reintegration of offenders would otherwise be a daunting task without the support of society where the offenders are expected to return to upon release from custody.

However, now that society understands the role they ought to play; other sectors within the correctional setting such as social workers and psychologists find their work easy to do as offenders are being reintegrated. Ntshangase further encouraged the spiritual care officers to put more work in helping offenders transform their lives as they played a key role, that of providing spiritual services.


Motivation

Through their pastoral encounters with offenders, chaplains provide emotional and spiritual support, helping offenders to begin the journey of transformation. Since chaplains are professionals with a wealth of positive life experience to draw upon, Ntshangase said they should thrive to avail themselves as offenders often seek guidance, positive motivation and encouragement. He said it is their responsibility to help offenders form a positive worldview and discover their true identity.

On the other hand, Chief Chaplain Superintendent Bethwell Dlamini has applauded Ntshangase for continuously supporting the various treatment programmes. Dlamini said though offenders are people who have been punished in accordance with the law, they are generally ignored and forgotten by the wider society. He said offenders are often isolated, aftaid, angry and hurting. They often lose self-esteem, value and all sense of worth upon imprisonment.

However, Dlamini mentioned that through the commissioner general's efforts and support, a number of offenders have discovered themselves; their potential and talents hence changed their way of life, all which works towards alleviating crime in our societies.

'MOVING FROM RHETORIC TO ACTION'

is Majesty King Mswati III even before he officially opens the Fifth Session of the 10th Parliament next Friday has already given us a clear indication of how 2018 will shape up.

The King has given a clear indication by directing how the two events that will shape 2018 should be handled.

The King has already directed that the 50/50 Double Celebration will be a big event but celebrated in a cost effective way by staging the main event at a smaller Mavuso Trade Exhibition Centre Sports Ground, whilst pitching big screens in the four regions for the Nation to follow and be part of the event.

This move clearly states that the country will not spent millions of Emalangeni on renovationsas it has been the case in the past on renovations, but much of the available budget will go directly to logistics and catering for the King and country's guests.

In the context of a tight budget this is a commendable move from His Majesty the King and a move that curtails any possibility of looting from those politicians who will be jettisoned in a matter of months.

As the King once said in our interview last year, for Somhlolo National Stadium to have hosted the event, it needed billions of Emalangeni which was to first go not just on renovations, but a total revamp.

Clearly we did not have those billions and time was not on our side to improve its capacity beyond the 15 000 to a 30 000 seater stadium.

This project has now been put aside for the new government coming in later in the year to see how it is carried forward.

For now, we will make do with a smaller but well managed affair at the Mavuso Sports Ground. The main event given Mavuso's small size should be an all card affair, whilst the rest of us follow it through the countrywide big screens around the country.

Meanwhile, His Majesty the King has shaken up the 55 Tinkhundla Centres and added four. Not only did he add the new tinkhundla, but further ensured that people who were previously disadvantaged in terms of service delivery are now catered for.

This he did by ensuring that chiefdoms which had no access to their constituency now have access and further areas that deserved to have bucopho (representation at inkhundla) now have representation by adding their numbers. The total of additional number of bucopho was 15 in all.

According to the Elections and Boundaries Commission report it states that only 170 chiefdoms out of 334 had easy access to their inkhundla. This represented 13 of the 55 con-

The report further reveals that 11 of the 59 tinkhundla will be re-located and these are; Mhlangatane, Motshane in the Hhohho Region, Kukhanyeni, Mafutseni, Mkhiweni, Mangcongco, and Manzini North in the Manzini Region,

Lomahasha, Dvokodvweni, Nkilongo in the Lubombo Region, and Kubuta in the Shiselweni

The King also approved the establishment of 22 sub-tinkhundla structures in 18 tinkhundla also referred to as Takhelate in the four regions.

The concept of sub-tinkhundla is necessitated by a number of factors which include distance, terrain, and population density which has a negative effect in its utilisation and service provision by the affected communities. The concept, therefore, seeks to balance service provision and utilisation of the inkhundla resources.

Improvement

His Majesty also approved the improvement of the country's state of the roads across the country especially in the rural communities, which it is said need urgent attention for the general accessibility by communities and ease of conducting elections.

He also approved the adjustment of regional boundaries to accommodate chiefdoms and

Reposistioning

One of the fundamental issues that need to be addressed as well is the repositioning of the chiefs into the entire developmental agenda. The constitution indicated that there should be a Council of Chiefs and a House of Chiefs, which will be consulted in case there were issues that would affect their being.

At the moment our government has no budget at all for our chiefs hence uncultured elect-

than their traditional fathers.

It is absurd that residents would run to an MP's home for help or services than visiting their imiphakatsi. Whilst throughelection people are tied to their chiefdoms, but operationally people act independently of their chiefs, hence their roles and relevance in society become marginalised.

Government would need to wake up and appreciate that this structure is most important in the being of society and therefore needs to be recognised and supported institutionally. financially and otherwise. It was from this premise when I said chiefs should be brought into the centre of the electoral process and not be at the periphery. Chiefs are the footstools of the institution of the Monarchy hence they should not be bystanders when critical national exercises are being done. What account would a chief give of an individual who has been elected and has no relationship with that person except that his/her pass book (lipase) names him as chief and therefore cannot be denied opportunity to stand. Whilst the EBC has attended to service delivery issues, someone else need to consider the position of chiefs of resources and services to be based on the ed MPs find themselves playing bigger roles in our political set-up and the role they play.

Dealing with Diabetes

iabetes is a chronic condition that affects people. If managed well, people with diabetes can live normal, healthy lives. However, the many devastating effects of uncontrolled or poorly controlled diabetes are fairly well known: Diabetes, which increases a person's chances of heart attack or stroke by 200 per cent to 400 per cent, respectively, is the seventh leading cause of death and the leading cause of adult blindness, kidney failure and lower-limb amputation. But with proper management and control through daily food, fitness, medication and lifestyle choices, people with diabetes can reduce their risk of diabetes related complications. That said, diabetes is largely a "self-care" disease, which means that most of the time, you are in charge of many day-to-day decisions that affect your condition. This responsibility puts an individual with diabetes in the driver's seat of their personal care team-and that's a lot of pressure! So what's the most important tool you need to successfully manage diabetes?

Knowledge

There is a lot of information available about diabetes. In the information age, there is certainly no shortage of diabetes related books, cookbooks, websites, and magazines. Unfortunately, information about diabetes is not always credible and some of the information out there is just flat-out incorrect or bad advice. How do you decide whether the information you read or hear about diabetes is safe and reliable? Fortunately, you don't have to do this on your own. A diabetes educator can help! A Certified Diabetes Educator is a qualified professional-typically, a registered nurse, registered dietician, or a pharmacist-that provides diabetes self-management education (DSME) or diabetes self-management training (DSMT). The American Association of Diabetes Educators defines DSMT as a collaborative process through which people with or at risk for diabetes gain the knowledge and skills needed to change behaviour and successfully self-manage diabetes and its related conditions. DSMT typically focuses on the following seven behaviours—sometimes referred to as the AADE7 TM Self-Care Behaviours:


- Healthy eating
- . Being active
- Monitoring
- Taking medication
- Problem solving
- . Healthy coping . Reducing risks

Your diabetes educator will help you understand what is going on inside your body. You'll learn the best methods of daily self-care and how everyday decisions regarding physical activity, meal planning, testing your blood sugar, taking your medication, and checking your feet all impact your condition-and your risk for the complications. Finally, a diabetes educator can explain the basic diabetes care you should be receiving from their doctor such

as A1C testing, foot exams, blood pressure, and cholesterol checks.

While there is typically a fee charged to receive diabetes education from a Certified Diabetes Educator, it is important to note that many health insurance plans, including Medicare, cover this cost. Contact your insurance carrier to make certain that your plan covers dia-

betes self-management education. If you are uninsured, you may be able to find free or reduced cost programmes through your local health department or hospital. Even if you have to pay some money out of pocket, it will be a very important investment in your health! Diabetes education offers people with diabetes or at risk for diabetes the knowledge and skills needed to modify behaviour and successfully self-manage diabetes and its related conditions. Education helps people with diabetes to achieve optimal health status, and reduces complications such as coronary artery disease, limb loss, renal disease, and vision loss. It also improves quality of life and reduces the need for costly health care in the future.

According to America Diabetes Association. We recommend that all those with diabetes should ideally meet with a certified diabetes educator (CDE). A CDE must meet several criteria in order to be certified in diabetes education. A CDE can be a registered nurse, dietician, doctor, pharmacist, or other licensed professional. To become a CDE, a healthcare professional must:

. Complete at least two years of professional practice and be specifically involved with diabetes education for two qualifying years.

Acquire at least 1000 hours of experience in a health care environment where he/she provides services as a diabetes ed vior.

· Must hold a job in a health care facility that treats diabetes on a regular basis.

 Must work at least 32 hours a week in diabetes education.

 Must successfully pass the National Certification Board for Diabetes Educators examination.

Once a diabetes educator becomes certified, he/she must maintain certification by retaking the exam or gaining continuing education credits every five years.

CEDs have the expertise to help you manage your diabetes. They provide vital insights into self-care behaviours that help you keep your diabetes in check: managing blood sugar, medication and insulin dose adjustment instruction, monitoring and exercise information, Many CDEs also specialise in insulin pumps and continuous glucose monitoring sensors.

Recommended foods for healthy diet:

Make your calories count with these nutritious foods:

. Healthy carbohydrates: During digestion, sugars (simple carbohydrates) and starches (complex carbohydrates) break down into blood glucose. Focus on the healthiest carbohydrates, such as fruits, vegetables, whole grains, legumes (beans, peas and lentils) and low-fat dairy prod-

. Fibre-rich foods: Dietary fibre includes all parts of plant foods that your body can't digest or absorb. Fibre can decrease the risk of heart disease and help control blood sugar levels. Foods high in fibre include vegetables, fruits, nuts, legumes (beans, peas and lentils), wholewheat flour and wheat bran.

. Heart-healthy fish: Eat heart-healthy fish at least twice a week. Fish can be a good alternative to high-fat meats. For example, cod, tuna and halibut have less total fat, saturated fat and cholesterol than do meat and poultry. Fish such as salmon, tuna, are rich in omega-3 fatty acids, which promote heart health by lowering blood fats called triglycerides. However, avoid fried fish and fish with high levels of mercury.

. 'Good' fats: Foods containing monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fats - such as avocados, almonds, pecans, walnuts, olives, and canola, olive and peanut oils - can help lower your cholesterol levels. Eat them sparingly, however, as all fats are high in calories.





ELECTIONS WILL NE THE SAME FOR 43 TINKHUNDLA

HE recently published delimitation report by the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) reveals that only 13 tinkhundla will remain unchanged in the upcoming elections later this year.

About 42 tinkhundla have been affected to the extent that one inkhundla (Hlane) was abolished, whilst five others were created; Nkomiyahlaba and Phondo in Manzini, Siphocosini in the Hhohho region, Gilgal in Lubombo and Kumethula in the Shiselweni region.

The 13 that would remain unchanged are as follows; Hhohho (Lobamba, Mbabane West, Mayiwane, Pigg's Peak, Ntonjeni and Timphisini), Manzini (Nhlambeni), Lubombo (Matsanjeni North, Lugongolweni and Mpolonjeni), and Shiselweni (Zombudze Emuva, Shiselweni I and

The report further reveals that some tinkhundla that were encroaching into other regions resulted in the re-adjustment of some region's boundaries to ensure that no inkhundla overlaps into another region and no one chief falls under two tinkhundla centres.

The EBC in defining the importance of the exercise they have just done, stated: "The boundary delimitation process is one of the key components and challenges of almost every electoral system. It has profound consequences for the electoral and political systems of the country; shaping constituencies through a delimitation process (that) can affect the fairness of elections and hence political representation."

It further states that it should be appreciated that even though there are no internationally agreed factors to take into account when delimiting boundaries, a number of organisations have drawn guidelines and principles to consider when delimiting boundaries.

"The principles include impartiality, equality, representativeness, non-discrimination and transparency. In furtherance of the same guidelines and principles, the EBC - an independent body and the country's Constitution provide for free and fair elections," the report states.

The report further states that whilst they were about 94 request for new tinkhundla, in producing this report they were guided by the Constitution which states that there can only be 60 tinkhundla centres and no more.

The following were the findings of the commission:

The findings of the exercise indicate a number of outcomes some of which were not anticipated. These include chiefdom boundaries that overlap into other tinkhundla and/or tinkhundla boundaries that overlap into other regions which is not in line with the requirements of the 1993 Delimitation Report. The findings generally speak to the following:

The existence of unresolved underlying chieftaincy disputes and chieftaincy boundaries which are a determining factor in the interest of conducting free and fair elections. Glaringly, some

communities had more or less the same bound-

- There is an emergence and existence of tinkhundla of convenience/operational tinkhundla which is a result of chiefdoms overlapping to one or more inkhundla and or chiefdoms realigning themselves with tinkhundla of their choice much against the 1993 Delimitation Commission Report.
- Some tinkhundla boundaries fell out of the regional boundaries, much against the Terms of Reference of the 1993 Delimitation Commission;
- Accessibility to most tinkhundla is a great challenge, which is mainly due to the bad state of roads across the country, especially in the rural communities, the distance of the inkhundla from the population and the terrain. This affects service delivery in general and specifically the upcoming elections.
- There is an observed discrepancy in the allocation of tinkhundla resources which does not consider the inkhundla population. Currently, resources are evenly distributed amongst the tinkhundla and regions without any justifica-
- There is a general outcry for additional Bucopho and polling stations.
- The naming of Tinkhundla by chiefdom names is a cause for concern for some communities.
- The Mhlume, Nkilongo, Manzini South, tinkhundla do not have permanent workstations.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The commission having reviewed the findings recommends the following:

- Urgent adjudication of underlying chieftaincy disputes and chieftaincy boundaries which are a determining factor in the interest of conducting free and fair elections.
- The establishment and construction of five tinkhundla namely;
- 1 Siphocosini in the Hhohho region,
- 2. Nkomiyahlaba and Phondo in the Manzini
- 3. Gilgal in the Lubombo region, and
- 4. Kumethula in the Shiselweni Region.
- 5. The construction of tinkhundla structures in the existing tinkhundla without structure (3) and these are;
- 1. Mhlume and Nkilongo in the Lubombo Region.
- 2. Manzini South in the Manzini Region.
- The construction of tinkhundla structures among the current tinkhundla that need to be relocated (11) and these are;
- 1. Mhlangatane, Motshane in the Hhohho Region, 2. Kukhanyeni, Mafutseni, Mkhiweni, Mangcongco,
- and Manzini North in the Manzini Region. 3. Lomahasha, Dvokodvweni, Nkilongo in the
- Lubombo Region, and 4. Kubuta in the Shiselweni Region

- The establishment of 22 sub-tinkhundla structures in 18 tinkhundla also referred to as Takhelate is recommended in the four regions. The concept of sub-tinkhundla is necessitated by a number of factors which include distance, terrain, and population density which has a negative effect in its utilisation and service provision by the affected communities. The concept, therefore, seeks to balance service provision and utilisation of the inkhundla resources.
- The state of the roads across the country especially in the rural communities needs urgent attention to ensure general accessibility by communities and ease of conducting elections.
- The adjustment of regional boundaries to accommodate chiefdoms and tinkhundla.
- The allocation and distribution of resources and services should be population based.
- Review of the names of some tinkhundla especially those that are named after chief-
- The additional Bucopho and suggested polling stations

SPECIFIC FINDINGS

Densely populated tinkhundla: The findings indicate that ten (10) tinkhundla as listed below have high population densities (above 10 000 according to the 2013 registered voters list) and have a large number of chiefdoms under them.

These are:

- Kukhanyeni
- Kwaluseni
- Lobamba Ludzeludze
- Lugongolweni
- Mkhiweni Motshane
- Ngwempisi
- Sandleni

Tinkhundla structures located in awkward areas: Some Tinkhundla structures (26) are inaccessible due to distance, terrain and position from where the population is mostly concentrated. Table 1, shows the number of Tinkhundla with structures that are inaccessible to a majority of the population.

Tinkhundla without structures: Currently, there are three Tinkhundla without structures and they operate on arranged community and private company structures as shown by Table

Tinkhundla to retain status quo: About 13 of the 55 Tinkhundla are relatively accessible and utilised considering their proximity, terrain and available transportation. Communities under these tinkhundla are comfortable with the attributes of their inkhundla. This is clearly depicted by Table 3.

The commission, having considered the high population density, distance, terrain and a large number of chiefdoms per inkhundla, recommended the following:

Establishment of Nkomiyahlaba inkhundla in the Manzini region is meant to ease the high population density and the large number of chiefdoms in the Kukhanyeni and Ludzeludze Tinkhudla. The new Inkhundla constitutes the following eight chiefdoms:

- Eni
- Sibuyeni
- Sankolweni
- Sigombeni
- Nsenga
- Ntunja Ngcayini
- Vusweni





Whatever the dream job was, almost all children would probably be able to give a definitive answer without hesitation when asked the question, "What do you want to be when you grow up?


Today we have one of the country's exceptional musicians Mzwaa, formally known as Mzwandile Nkosi. He specialises on soulful house music.

Driven by the burning desire to bring hope and healing through music, Mzwaa's enchanting vocals and captivating lyrics aspire to transcend the listener's state of mind to one that resonates with happiness, love and peace. Born and raised in the heart of the Kingdom of eSwatini, Manzini - Sterksroom to be exact, his love for music was fuelled by his parents - not as musicians themselves but as devoted lovers and collectors of music. His father offered Mzwandile an early exposure to jazz music and from his mother, Mzwaa picked up a love for soul, rhythm and blues inspired by the Motown era.

Inspiration

Artists such as James Brown, Michael Jackson and Sade formed part of his early influences and more recently, he draws inspiration from the likes of Amy Winehouse, Glenn Underground and Kendrick Lamar. "If anything I owe this love I have for music to my parents. They might have not known it then but the seed they planted in me has started to bear fruit," he tells L&E.

uring his time living in Pretoria, while pursuing his tertiary education, Mzwaa worked with Pretoria-based house music sensation Ta-Ice as well as O'man Blues (formerly known as Mr O).

"My exposure to the underground music scene in Pretoria crafted my song-writing. If it wasn't school then it was music, whether recording or just bouncing ideas off each other. I'm glad to see that a lot of the guys have gone on to have reputable careers. This challenges me even more to make it a priority to realise the full potential of my talent," he shares.

His collaboration with O'man Blues titled Take Control was released last year on O'man Blues' EP titled Rebirth Pt.1 which featured the likes of Dindy and DJ Sue as well. "I recently completed collaborating with local soulful house ensemble Gruv Basement. The song is titled Fight Another Day and it touches on some of the challenges I had to overcome in 2017. It's a song dear to me and I hope it will play a role in encouraging the youth to rise above their hardships, especially considering the heightened youth suicides the country has been experiencing. I believe it will be one of the stand out releases within local house music this year."

Based on his love for a variety of genres, Mzwaa's music is a cocktail of soul, rhythm and blues with notable fragments of jazz and house. However, it was through meeting his current band, The Natural Selection, that Mzwaa found the missing piece to his puzzle. How ironic that this missing piece had been hiding in plain sight as The Natural Selection





Tell us about your album

It is a 10-track offering titled 'Bunye be Africa' with the theme calling upon the black community (Swazis and Africans in general) to unite and stop the backbiting and jealousy. There is one track dedicated to Swazi culture (Ingabisa) where we revel about the beauty of maidens, Sangoma, obviously about my trade, the title track where we celebrate the indelible marks left by His Majesty King Mswati III on SADC and the world at large with his leadership skills, Ufunani Emuva Kimi which is a personal experience but something that happens every day where women attempt to reconcile with their ex-boyfriends whom they ditched when the going was tough, and one instrumental version, amongst others. We are saying Africans must jointly fight poverty and immorality

How is the response thus far?

We are making waves and on stage *mbhaqanga* music fanatics just go crazy. As those who were at Mavuso Trade Centre and Timbali Lodge last year. We performed before Soul Brothers but the encores from the crowd reverberated like the mighty legends were performing. We have run out of stock already as we had printed 800 CD copies. Just the other day a client from Cape Town who slept over here pur-



chased the CD and couldn't help but marvel at the works. The Sithobela community fell in love the first time and surrounding towns such as Matata and Siphofaneni can't get enough of our music. The only challenge being the inadequate pay as I don't believe in mimicking but performing live with the full band and that is costly; with some not keen in meeting us halfway yet they want our music. So thus far my businesses are funding the music passion but am hoping in future this won't be the case.

How do you juggle music, business and being an inyanga?

That's a tough one. There were times when my clients missed me a lot as I was in studio. As for the various businesses, they are in good hands and I can't complain. On the overall I'm learning to juggle these demanding responsibilities as I can't ditch either.

How has SWAMA assisted you?

In a way I cannot imagine. The various grand stages such as Mavuso Trade Centre and Timbali Lodge are because of them. My children even assisted in registering Sithobela Band into the platform created by SWAMA and Swazi MTN, which to me was a milestone. One can only hope and pray that SWAMA will one day assist artists record their music.

Going forward, what can we expect?

We will continue making music. Actually, we have already composed new songs and will soon go in studio to record. We are still trying to figure out which studio to use in SA. If people were shocked by the debut album, let them wait until we release this upcoming one. It will be a bomb I tell you. I'm also working on a succession plan, which is why the group is Sithobela Band and not Sikhwehle Mlotsa as the younger generation from the community must join in. But I'm happy that I created employment opportunities for mostly the younger generation in my home area as they can attest how their lives were transformed through music as our dancers.

Pastor Sambulo Khumalo

hrough all storms, trials and tribulations that one may face in life, God is still worthy to be praised and worshiped.

This is the message from Pastor Sambulo Khumalo an upcoming gospel star who is based in South Africa who recently released his second album titled Sengilungele. As if he takes after his name, Sambulo which means revelation, Khumalo has a testimony and a revelation to share with the world through his gospel music.

The humble and soft spoken yet confident minister of the gospel in music says he has gone through difficult times in his life but was able to go through the storms and emerge victorious. "The biggest challenge was growing up without a father when you knew someone is your father. I was abandoned and neglected by my father; the situation was serious such that he even sent people to my maternal family to say I am not his son. This situation made my granny to have more reason to take me to church. I remember at some point she told me not to both-

ensured that she looked after me and used money she made from weaving mats to ensure that I did not lack" he

He says after the motivation and encouragement from his granny he decided to take the challenges as a test from God which he says has passed with flying colours and came out of it all with the message contained in his album titled Sengilungele which means, I am ready. Indeed he says he is ready to take the stages by storm with his powerful music ministry which dates back from his childhood days.

This left me with a personal motto which says 'it calls for a seed to die just before it can germinate, grow and bear fruit, therefore don't shy away from challenges for they make of you what you were initially purposed for'.

"I have always been a worshipper thus doors opened in South Africa where I found myself serving in the church. I am currently serving in South Africa in a full-time ministry in the church. The music ministry is part of the calling I have from God. I used to sing with her when weaving mats where she would call me to sit by her side and we would sing together. When I was matured and started understanding the gospel, I got to realise there were sermons. Over time I have seen God in my life as a God who really cares" he says.

Born in 1987, he started his gospel music journey at the age eight as he was raised by a God-fearing family mainly his grandmother who was a staunch member of Madulini Free Evangelical Assemblies where she still serves. 

RECOMMENDATIONS: Retain status-quo for all chiefdoms under Lobamba inkhundla. The total number of chiefdoms will be five under Lobamba inkhundla, namely Elangeni, Ezabeni, Ezulwini, Lobamba and Nkhanini.

DERMA CATION BOUNDARY

- Mdzimba Mentain was used as boundary between Hhukwini and Lobamba inkhundla.
- Urban boundary was used as a common boundary between Lobamba and Mbabane West.
- Old inkhundla boundary was used to separate Mantabeni chiefdom under the newly established Siphocosini inkhundla from Ezulwini chief-
- Between Ludzeludze and Lobamba inkhundla, Liposi River was used as proposed Regional boundary
- Between Lobamba and Lobamba Lomdzala inkhundla, where Mhlambanyatsi River joins Lusutfu River, Mhlambanyatsi was used as the proposed regional boundary for Manzini and Hhohho regions.

RECOMMENDATIONS: Reallign Mavula chiefdom from Mhlangatane to Madlangempisi inkhundla and retain bucopho as per their request. It would have been ideal for Nyonyane/Maguga to be re-alligned to Ndzingeni inkhundla in the Sub-inkundla at Nkonyeni area, however the scarcity of transport is a challange. The total number of chiedoms will be will be six, namely Nyonyane/Maguga, Buhlebuyeza/Tfuntini, Dvokolwako/Kuphakameni. Mzaceni/Ekukhulumeni and Mavula chiefdom.

DERMACATION BOUNDARY

- Intersection between Gucuka chiefdom under Madlangempisi inkhundla and Madlolo chiefdom under Maphalaleni inkhundla, a cardastral boundary was used to dermacate the two tinkhundla
- Intersection between Mhlangatane and Madlangempisi inkhundla, Mavula chiefdom operational boundary and the Regional boundary was used to dermacate the two tinkhundla.
- Intersection between Mhlume and Madlangempisi, cardastral line which is also the old inkhundla boundary was used to dermacate the two tinkhundla.



Re-allign Ntsanjeni and Meleti chiefdoms to a sub-inkhundla at Nkonyeni under Ndzingeni inkhundla because of long distance and poor road infrastructure to Maphalaleni inkhundla.



DVCKODVWENI

The approximate distances of these two chiefdoms (Meleti and Ntsanjeni) to Maphalaleni is 22 km while to Ndzingeni it is 15 km. it would have been ideal to establish an inkhundla at Nkonyeni area, however due to the low population, the sub-station under discussion is recommended.

The distance for these chiefdoms to the sub-inkhundla is about 4 km. Reallign Sitseni and Kasiko chiefdoms to Hhukwini inkhundla. Even though the distance to Maphalaleni (approximately 7.9 km) and

Hhukwini (approximately 8.1 km) is more or less the same for these chiefdoms, Hhukwini is most preferable as it has better road infrastructure. Maphalaleni, Dlozini and Mcengeni chiefdoms will remain under the main inkhundla.

The total number of chiefdoms to remain under Maphalaleni will be six (6), namely Maphalaleni, Dlozini, Mcengeni, Nsingweni, Madlolo and Mfeni.

DERMACATION BOUNDARY

- Intersection boundary between Mkhiweni and Maphalaleni inkhundla, Mbuluzi River which is also a Regional boundary (Hhohho and Manzini) was used to dermacate the two tinkundla at Mbelebeleni and Nsingweni chiefdoms, eliminating Mbelebeleni overlap.
- Intersection boundary between Dvokolwako and Maphalaleni Mbuluzi River which is also a Regional boundary (Hhohho and Manzini) was used to cut the two tinkhundla at Dvokolwako and Mbuluzi army barracks which is physically at Maphalaleni inkhundla.
- Intersection between Hhukwini and Nkomiyahlaba inkhundla, Farm portion D/LC22 P joins Hholoshini River which moves down to Mbuluzi River was used as boundary.
- Intersection between Gucuka chiefdom under Madlangempisi inkhundla and Madlolo chiefdom under Maphalaleni inkhundla, cardastral boundary was used to dermacate the two tinkhundla.





RECOMMENDATIONS: In addition to Musunduza, Fontein and Sidwashini chiefdoms under Mbabane East inkhundla, Mdzimba chiefdom which was under Nkhaba inkhundla will be incorporated because of long distance to Nkhaba inkhundla. There is no direct transport from Mdzimba to Nkhaba and people have to go via Mbabane. Infact they have to pass three tinkhundla, Mbabane East, Mbabane West and Motshane to reach Nkhaba inkhundla.

The total number of chiefdoms will now be four (4) under Mbabane East *inkhundla*, namely Musunduza, Fontein, Sidwashini and Mdzimba.


RECOMMENDATIONS: Retain status-quo for all chiefdoms under Mbabane West inkhundla. The total number of chiefdoms will be three (3) under Mbabane West inkhundla namely, Mangwaneni, Manzana and Nkwalini.



The total number of chiedoms will be nine (9), namely Mgungundlovu, Ludlawini, Ndzingeni, Bulandzeni, Kwaliweni, Mvuma, Nkamanzi, Ntsanjeni and Meleti.

- Kwaliweni chiefdom under Ndzingeni inkhudla was used a boundary for Piggs Peak inkhundla.

- Intersection between Nkamanzi chiefdom under Ndzingeni inkhundla and Herefords chiefdom under Mayiwane inkhundla, Iholoba stream was used as


RECOMMENDATIONS: Re-allign Mdzimba chiefdom to Mbabane East inkhundla because of the long distance (41 km). There is no direct transport from Mdzimba to Nkhaba and people have to go via Mbabane. Infact they have to pass three (3) tinkhundla, Mbabane East, Mbabane West and Motshane to reach Nkhaba inkhundla. The total number of chiefdoms under Nkhaba inkhundla will then be four (4) namely, Nkhaba, Ekuvinjelweni, Malanti, eJubukweni.

- Cardastral boundary Farm R/239 was used as a common boundary for Nkhaba and Motshane inkhundla
- Malolotja Nature reserve was moved to Piggs Peak inkhundla, Nkomanzi River was used as a boundary.



RECOMMENDATIONS: Relocate inkhundla structure to be built next to Motshane High School. Reallign Mantabeni, Siphocosini, Sigangeni and Luhlendlweni to a newly established inkhundla at Siphocosini.

The current inkhundla structure will be a sub-inkhundla to serve Sigangeni and Luhlendlweni chiefdoms under the newly established inkhundla at Siphocosini. Reason behind the changes is the complexity in the accessibility by chiefdoms to the current inkhundla structure because of poor road infrastructure and inavailability of direct transport.

Mantabeni and Siphocosini chiefdoms have to go via Mbabane and pass two tinkhundla (Mabane West and Mbabane East) to reach either the current (about 47 km) or the proposed relocated Motshane inkhundla (16km) hence the establishment of the Siphocosini inkhundla is justified. Furthermore, Motshane inkhundla has the highest registered population in the country. The total number of chiefdoms under the newly relocated Motshane inkhundla will be three (3), namely Nduma, Kupheleni, and Mpolonjeni.

DERMACATION BOUNDARY

- Old inkhundla boundary was used to remove Mantabeni chiefdom location from Ezulwini chiefdom boundary.
- Cardastral boundary Farm R/239 was used as a common boundary for Nkhaba and Motshane inkhundla on the east.

ducation and skills are essential for the realisation of individual potential, national economic growth, social development and the fostering of global citizenship.

In the coming decades, as technology, demographic change and globalisation reshape the world we live in, they will become ever more important.

Economies will rise or fall depending more on their intellectual resources than their physical resources. The valuation of companies will depend more on human capital than physical capital. The pathway to growth for developing economies will depend less on traditional forms of export-led growth and more on education-led growth.

And yet the world today is facing a global learning crisis. If current trends continue, by 2030 – the date the international community has set for attaining quality secondary education for all – less than 10 percent of young people in low-income countries will be on track to gain basic secondary level skills. The costs of this learning crisis – unemployment, poverty, inequality and instability – could undermine the very fabric of our economies and societies.

But there is a better vision for the future of global education and young people. Indeed, it is possible to ensure that all children and youth are in school and learning the skills they need to be successful in work and life. Based on research from the Education Commission, this vision is achievable within a generation if all countries accelerate their progress to that of the world's top 25 per cent fastest improvers in education. This report proposes the largest expansion of educational opportunity in history and outlines the reforms and increased financial investment required to achieve it.

Today's generation of young people faces a radically changing world.

Half of the world's jobs—around 2 billion—are expected to disappear due to automation by 2030. In some countries, up to 80 per cent of today's jobs could be lost. New technologies that are disrupting industries and changing the nature of work will increase the demand for high-skilled labour and make many low- and medium-skilled jobs obsolete.


Young people in developing countries will face the greatest challenges in the years ahead. With many of the world's low-skilled jobs most susceptible to automation, developing economies will be at greater risk of technology-induced unemployment. In the past, many developing economies achieved growth by moving farm workers into factories.

In the future, new growth models will need to be found, but these will require higher levels of skills than developing economies are currently set to offer. Changing global demographics will exacerbate this challenge with the greatest population increases occurring in countries currently lagging furthest behind in education. By 2050, African countries will be home to a billion young people.

Already some 40 per cent of employers globally are finding it difficult to recruit people with the skills they need.

If education in much of the world fails to keep up with the rising demand for skills, there will be major shortages of skilled workers in both developing and developed economies as well as large surpluses of workers with poor skills. This skills gap threatens to have far-reaching economic, social, and political repercussions. The growing skills gap will stunt global economic growth and reverse progress towards ending extreme poverty. Without action to give young people the education and skills they need

to compete, more than a quarter of the population in low-income countries could still be living in extreme poverty in 2050.

The impact of poor education on health will be equally severe.

Projections suggest that by 2050, the number of lives lost each year because of a failure to provide adequate access to quality education would equal those lost today to HIV and malaria, two of the most deadly global diseases. By 2050, population growth would be at least 15 per cent higher than if all children were learning—a critical factor in development as a whole.

If inequality in education persists, the implications for global stability are also dire.

Historical analysis shows that inequality fuels unrest and when educational inequality doubles, the probability of conflict more than doubles. Unrest is likely to be greatest where the gap between youth expectations and daily realities is widest.

Population movements could further compound these pressures. Today, the number of people displaced by conflict is at an all-time high and migration from conflict, climate change, and economic strains is set to increase. The number of international migrants, many of whom will have been denied the opportunity to acquire skills, is estimated to grow to around 400 million people by 2050. With education critical to resilience and cohesion, the death of skills will increase vulnerability to shocks and the risks of instability across the world.

Where economic, technological, demographic, and geopolitical trends collide with weak education systems, the risks of instability, radicalisation, and economic decline are at their greatest. If the world does not equip all young people with the skills they will need to participate in the future economy, the costs of inaction and delay could be irreparable.

Quality education is the most critical factor in closing the skills gap and one of the

most important in determining a child's future success.

Yet, education in many developing countries is not improving and children are instead falling dangerously behind.

Today, 263 million children and young people in the world are out of school, and the number of primary-aged children not in school is increasing. For those children who are in school, many are not actually learning.

In low- and middle-income countries, only half of primary school children and little more than a quarter of secondary school children are learning basic skills. The Education Commission projects that if current trends continue; by 2030 over three-quarters of a billion young people in low-and middle-income countries will not be on track to acquire basic secondary-level skills.

In low-income countries, only one out of 10 will be on track.

Without urgent change, more than 1.5 billion adults will have no education beyond primary school in 2030.

he definition of sustainable entrepreneurship is established from two broad perspectives of sustainability development and entrepreneurship. However, for the sake of this research less detail will be established from the two variables.

Sustainable development according to Racelis (2014:50) is a developmental initiative that is focused on meeting the needs of the present still preserving those of the future. Sustainable development in this regards becomes a balance between the present and the future. It creates a platform of balance between the utilities of the present and the future; this means that through sustainable development, the process of development becomes a continuous focus of the entire society. Koe and Majid (2013:286) states that the present understanding of the relevance of sustainable entrepreneurship has preserved the 1972 declaration of the United Nation Conference on the Human Environment where it was clearly defined as a "Development that meets the needs of the present generation without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own


Peeters (2012:8) averts that sustainable development has taken a common view point of an interactive platform of three critical elements namely the society or people, the ecology or planet and the economic which is the gain or profit. Pavlic, Portolan, and Butorac, (2013:73) brings out a much more clearer meaning of sustainable development but from the production perspective by stating that it is a process of change of production and consumption at global level that does not interfere the ecosystem. This notion creates the importance of human consumption and production though at a global level, but the ideology of the interdependence of the factors of production become very important in this regard. Land, labour, capital, and entrepreneurship become meaningful elements that brings about production and consumption. These elements would however need to be preserved for even up coming generations.

Entrepreneurship on the other hand has been defined as a culture and economic perspective which has brought about the different views from both social and economic point of view. However, Raudeliūniene, Tvaronavičiene, and Dzemyda (2014:73) argue that entrepreneurship can be defined from both the internal and external perspectives. The internal one focuses much on the qualities of an individual and how that person can have access to knowledge, creativity, the degree of self confidence and determination and the establishment of the ideal set of skills that were relevant to facilitate production. The external aspect focuses on the ability to be mindful of the societal opportunities in the external environment being local or global. However, the third dimension with regards to entrepreneurship is the integral aspect which is associated with joining of both internal and external elements. This is also considered as the managerial aspect of the key performance indicators of any business variability (Pavlic, et al, 2013:73)

Muñoz (2013:7) define sustainable entrepreneurship as a process that included the manipulation of the environment for economic opportunities. Sustainable entrepreneurship takes into consideration the preservation of the environment for economic benefit for future

benefits through creation of utilities. Bergset and Fichter (2015:20) definite sustainable entrepreneurship from an innovative perspective as they state that it was a mechanism that was orientated in creating social and economic values through the use of the environmental facilities. The understanding that is from this concept is that sustainable development becomes some form individualistic market- orientation driven initiative in which individuals in the society believe the importance of the creating a such more sustainable environment for social benefits.

Management

In this regards sustainable entrepreneurship focuses on the need to create a less harmful business environment. However, researchers like Raudeliūniene, (2014:73) argue that the definition of sustainable entrepreneurship can also be perceived from four different perspectives; namely the psychological point of view, management, economical perspective, and the educational point of view.

From the psychological dimension, social entrepreneurship is associated with personal traits and individual characteristics as fundamental elements that contributed to the success of an organisation or business enterprises. Zhang and Zhang (2013:159) argue that business growth and development was affected by the nature of certain personal characteristics and traits. This consideration brings the element of the importance in associating certain business practices with the some per-

sonality traits. In the field of scientific management, the influence of an entrepreneur is perceived to take an influential dimension from a strategic perspective that creates a linkage between the business' objectives and its abilities to meet the market demands through the mobilisation of resources which are also factors of production.

Results

The economic perspective however, brings to light the stance of perceiving an entrepreneurship venture as a result orientated one that was to bring out the expected results. The economic consideration of entrepreneurship focuses on the need to solve a social challenge both at a micro and macro level. Finally the educational school of thought, social entrepreneurship becomes relevant as a focal point for knowledge base and innovativeness. Moloi (2014:82) argues that one of the prominent features that has made the existence of the entrepreneurship one of the most ideal business venture is that of its desire and ability to change for the better in the manner products were made and it is only through creativity and innovation that became possible (Raudeliūniene, Tvaronavičiene, and Dzemyda,

The given scope about the social entrepreneurship creates a much meaningful and simplistic understanding about the actual emergent of social entrepreneurship in the sense that this school of thought comes as a result of the combination of both conventional entrepreneurship whose aim is to create an economic gain or profit and social entrepreneurship whose aim is to create a social and ecological benefit to the society. However, the combination of the two brings about a much more viable economic outcome of business performance in the society enterprise.

Based on the illustration of figure 2.1 and 2.2, sustainable entrepreneurship becomes an integral component of the sustainable development because entrepreneurship acts as a mechanism for creation of utility which stimulates consumption. Through sustainable entrepreneurship, production and consumption becomes relatively important for the continuity of the entire society. This orientation places the need of entrepreneurship at the center of entre combination of all the critical sectors of sustainability namely the economic which focused on business growth, efficiency, and stability; social sustainability that focuses on human empowerment, poverty eradication, and culture influence; and the ecological perspective that focuses on the relevance and preservation of the natural resources, pollution and the importance of biodiversity (Racelis, 2014:50; Bergset and Fichter, 2015:20).

dating someone else.

They would pry, they would investigate and

lay their eyes and even hands on the other woman.

When she gets to know her, she will even have her contact numbers and save her in her cellphone.

Every profile picture posted and status renewed is a way to chide and poke the other woman. She may present a picture where the two of you were apparently in joyful times, *ayibonge lendvodza* below the picture *imangale nayonayifundza* where all that would be coming from. She is actually telling the woman that she is wasting her time *yena nendvodza yakhe baGrand!*

Impact

It will have an impact believe Scales for when the husband makes his call he will find the other lady grumpy, sour and militant.

"Ngicela ubuyele kumfati wakho tsine uyekele mine phansi." You are not going to ignore LaMasango who would tag her husband along each time she went to the clinic kuyawukala sisu, she even took him along for scanning and in each occasion opportunity allowing she would snap a few photos.

1. Spot-on Treatments

urrently, spot-on tream ents are the most effective weapon against fleas. They do not wash off and step the flea life-cycle development.

Get you. veterinarian's advice on a treatment based on your dog's size, weight and age—too little won't work, and too much can be toxic.

2. Oral Medications

Flea control pills disrupt the life cycle of fleas, but do not kill adult fleas on contact. But giving your dog a monthly pill is a good choice around small children to reduce exposure to potentially irritating topical treatments.

3. Flea Shampoos

Flea shampoos don't provide long-lasting protection, so at the height of flea season it is generally recommended to use the shampoo every two weeks.

4. Flea Collars

A flea collar may be sufficient in light infestations but probably not in heavily infested areas. Put two fingers under the collar to prevent securing it on too tightly. Flea collars contain toxic chemicals so keep out of reach of small children. Watch out for scratching around the collar; some dogs are extremely sensitive to the chemicals.

5. Flea Dips

Dips are diluted with water, topically applied, and left on. These chemical products can be very potent and very dangerous. Get a veterinarian's advice and follow the instructions carefully according to your dog's size, weight and age. Do not use on pregnant, nursing or young pets less than four months old.

6. Powders and Sprays

Use cautiously! They can cause irritation to sensitive, unprotected parts of the body in both people and pets and can kill puppies and kittens. Protect the mouth and eyes, and take care that neither you nor your pet breathe this treatment in.

7. Clean House

To get rid of a serious flea infestation, you need

to clean your house and your dog simultaneously. Vacuum your home thoroughly and throw out the bag when you're done. Wash your dog's bedding and clean his toys with warm, soapy water. Vacuum your car.

8. Household Sprays and Foggers

These will kill adult fleas, larvae and eggs as they hatch. Take care - these products can be toxic to fish, birds, dog, cats and children. First get advice from your veterinarian and follow the instructions carefully.

9. Flea Traps

Buy or home-make. To make one at home, set a small dish of soapy water on the ground near a light overnight. Attracted by the warmth and light, fleas will jump into the water and become trapped.

10. Clear the Yard

Keep your lawn, bushes and trees trimmed back. You can also use outdoor chemical treatments, but remember, these products are toxic and can have harmful effects.

Herbal treatments.

Rosemary Flea Dip - Steep two cups of fresh rosemary in boiling water for 30 minutes. Strain the liquid, discard the leaves and add a gallon of warm water. Pour the tepid solution over your dog until he's soaked and let him drip-dry.

Lavender Essential Oil - Wash your dog thoroughly and towel dry. Apply a few drops of lavender essential oil to the base of the tail and another at the neck.

Brewer's Yeast - add a small Brewer's yeast tablet to your dog's food. But check with your veterinarian first.

Apple Cider Vinegar - Dilute 50/50 with water, pour into a spray bottle and use as a repellent.

Lemon Spray Repellent - Quarter a lemon, cover with boiling water and leave overnight. In the morning, spray all over your dog, protecting the eyes, ears and nose.





The revised standard now also requires that risk management be part of the organisation's structure, processes, objectives, strategy and activities.

It places a greater focus on creating value as the key driver of risk management and features other related principles such as continual improvement, the inclusion of stakeholders, being customized to the organization and consideration of human and cultural factors. The content has been streamlined to reflect an open systems model that regularly exchanges feedback with its external environment in order to fit a wider range of needs and contexts. The key objective is to make things clearer and easier, using plain language to define the fundamentals of risk management in a way that the reader will find easier to comprehend. The terminology is now more concise, with certain terms being moved to ISO Guide 73, Risk management -Vocabulary, which deals specifically with risk management terminology and is intended to be used alongside ISO 31000. Work has commenced on a terminology standard and implementation handbook to further enhance the understanding and applicability of the standard.

n avocado is technically a fruit. It is the fatty fruit of the avocado tree, scientifically known as Persea Americana. It is native to Mexico and Central America. There are many different types of avocados, varying in colour, size and shape.

Avocados are usually pear-shaped to round and they come in many different shades of green, ranging from pale green to almost black when fully ripe. The most popular type is called Hass avocado, which is round with black skin

Nutritional value of avocados

The avocado consists of 73 per cent water, 15 per cent fat, 8.5 per cent carbohydrates (mostly fibres) and 2 per cent protein.

Carbohydrates: Compared to other fruits, avocados contain very little sugar. Half an avocado (68 grams) contains only 0.5 grams of sugar, in the form of glucose, fructose and galactose. The net digestible carbohydrates are only 1.8 grams for each 100 grams of avocado. Because of the low sugar content, they are expected to have a very low glycemic index score, which means that they should not raise blood sugar levels much.

Fibre: Fibre occupies most of the carbohydrate content (79per cent) of avocados. Half an avocado provides 4.5 grams of fibre, which is very high. Dietary fibre is an important dietary component with many health benefits. It can regulate appetite, feed the friendly bacteria in the gut and reduce the risk of many diseases. Avocados also contain FODMAPs (fermentable oligo-, di-, monosaccharides and polyols), which are short-chain carbohydrates that some people cannot digest.

Fats: Avocados are an excellent source of "good' fat, which have beneficial effect on inflammation. It is a rich source of monounsaturated fatty acids. The most abundant fatty acid is oleic acid, which is the main component of olive oil and is linked to reducing inflammation and cancer.

Vitamins And Minerals: Avocados are rich in many essential vitamins and minerals. Some of them are:

Folate (B9): Which is important for normal cell function and tissue growth, and is particularly important for pregnant women.

Vitamin K1: Vitamin K1 is important for blood clotting, and may have benefits for bone health.


Potassium: Beneficial for blood pressure control and heart health. Avocados actually contain more potassium than bananas.

Copper: A trace element that is relatively low in the Western diet. Low copper intake may have adverse effects on heart health.

Vitamin E: A powerful antioxidant, often found in high amounts in fatty plant foods.

Vitamin B6: A group of related vitamins that

Vitamin C: An antioxidant that is important for immune function and skin health.

Carotenoids: Such as lutein and zeaxanthin, which are important for eye health and may reduce the risk of age-related eye diseases.

Persenones A and B: Unique antioxidants that may have protective effects against inflammation and cancer.

D-Mannoheptulose: A type of sugar found in avocados, claimed to assist with blood sugar control

Avocados are very high in carotenoid antioxidants, and eating fat along with these antioxidants tends to increase their absorption into the body.

Health benefits of avocados

Heart Health: Blood cholesterol, triglycerides, inflammatory markers and blood pressure have all been associated with increased risk of heart disease. Research has shown that avocado consumption may reduce blood cholesterol and triglycerides significantly, as well as lower the potentially harmful LDL cholesterol and increase the good HDL cholesterol.

Reducing Symptoms Of Athritis: Arthritis is a common problem in Western countries, characterised by progressive deterioration of the joint cartilage. Avocado and soybean unsaponifiables are supplements made from avocado oil (33 per cent) and soybean oil (66 per cent), primarily used to suppress symptoms in people with arthritis. Multiple studies have shown that these supplements can reduce symptoms of arthritis, especially of the knee and hip.

Cancer: Adequate intake of folate from food has shown promise in protecting against colon, stomach, pancreatic, and cervical cancers. Although the mechanism behind this apparent reduction in risk is currently unknown, researchers believe that folate protects against undesirable mutations in DNA and RNA during cell division.

Antimicrobial Action: Avocados contain substances that have antimicrobial activity, particularly against *Escherichia coli*, a leading cause of food poisoning.

Summary: Avocado Facts The Fruit

- 1. Although they're often referred to as a vegetable, avocados are technically a fruit — they're a single-seed berry that grows on a tree!
- 2. There are hundreds of different types of avocados, ranging from the oval-shaped, light-skinned bacon variety to the pear-shaped, thin-skinned zutano variety. Each type differs in shape, size, skin type, taste, and texture.
- 3. The colour of an avocado's skin isn't the

best way to determine ripeness. Hold the avocado in the palm of your hand and give it a gentle squeeze instead; ripe avocado will be firm, but will yield slightly to gentle pressure.



owadays, Net Promoter Score is used by many large companies as a customer feedback tool.

The Net Promoters Score (NPS) is a simple but powerful tool to measure client satisfaction with a single question of "How likely would you recommend company X, product or brand to a friend, colleague or family member?" The NPS in essence, assesses the extent to which a respondent would recommend a certain company, service or product to friends, family or colleagues.

The Net Promoters Score was developed in 2003 by Fred Reichfield who was a founder of Bain & Company's Loyalty practice. The NPS is also believed to give a good indication of growth potential and customer loyalty for a product or company. Net Promoters Score is described as, "An index that measures the willingness of customers to recommend a company's products or services to others. It is used as an alternate for gauging the customers overall satisfaction with a company's product or service and the customers loyalty to the brand."

Depending on the score given, three categories of people can be identified from the NPS results; Promoters, Passives and Detractors. Promoters are very enthusiastic customers who would willfully recommend you to other people. If there are not enough promoters for your company, you should think of actions you can take to increase your number of promoters. Tracking your company's NPS does not automatically change anything in your company. What is key is how that information is used to bring about positive changes.

PAC veteran re-arrested in the middle of the night

Johannesburg - Former political prisoner Kenny Motsamai, who is currently on parole, was detained on Thursday night hours before a doctor's appointment. Prisons wardens accompanied by a police van pounced on him at his Katlehong home at midnight.

His daughter, Busi, said the officers did not explain the reason for the arrest and the family yesterday morning roped in EFF chairperson Advocate Dali Mpofu; who was key in getting Motsamai out of jail last year after spending 27 years behind bars.

"My father always informs prison authorities of his movements and this week he was granted permission to go to Pretoria twice and today he was supposed to see a doctor at 1 Military Hospital for injuries he sustained to his foot from wearing tracking braces," said Busi.

"This borders on harassment. They came here in the middle of the night and handcuffed him. Police said they only asked to escort the wardens to arrest him. We still don't know why he was arrested," said Busi.

Department of Correctional Services National Spokesperson Singabakho Nxumalo could not immediately comment on Motsamai's re-arrest. "I know



that he complained to us about the ankle braces... Officials are supposed to first seek clarity or explain why they are arresting a parolee who might have violated parole condition before an arrest is made.

It means its something very serious if they just arrest a parolee," said Nxumalo. Mpofu could not be reached immediately for comment.

Last month, Motsamai celebrated his

first year anniversary of his release from Boksburg Prison after spending 27 years for killing a white traffic officer in Rustenburg in 1989. Prior his release, Motsamai was granted a day parole with strict conditions that included leaving the prison at 8am and being back by 4pm. During this eight-month-long parole, he was fitted with a monitoring device on his left ankle.

Fire Bathabile Dlamini - COSATU

JOHANNESBURG - Social Development Minister Bathabile is holding both the Constitutional Court and the "entire nation" in contempt by applying for an extension of the Cash Paymaster Services (CPS) grants contract, the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU) said.

In a statement on Thursday night, it called for Dlamini to be removed from her post immediately and to be investigated.

The SA Social Security Agency's application to the Constitutional Court was a sign of "a dearth of leadership at government level,' the trade union federation said.

The National Education, Health and Allied Workers' Union (NEHAWU) said it was "disingenuous" to claim that the payment by CPS needed to be phased out when the minister and SASSA were "well aware" they had had a year to cut ties with CPS, by March 2018.

"SASSA made a commitment to start using Postbank as from 1 February 2018 to pay social grants. We are now baffled as to why it would need to extend the CPS contract by another six months when the Constitutional Court made it unequivocally clear that the contract with CPS was both illegal and invalid.," NEHAWU said.

COSATU said it was "shocked

but not surprised" that SASSA had once again applied to the court to illegally extend its CPS social grants contract.

"Yet again, Minister Dlamini and SAS. A are toying with the laws of the Republic on this matter. They are obviously irredeemable and will never come right."

COSATU said it was time Deputy President Cyril Ramaphosa intervened.

It asked him and the government to "release Dlamini from her responsibilities, overhaul the SASSA leadership and remove the social grants programme from SASSA's executive control and place it under the responsibility of the minister in the presidency and the finance minister, reporting directly to Ramaphosa".

It is not the first time COSATU has called for Dlamini to be axed. COSATU called for the Post Office and Post Bank to be paying social grants within 100 calendar days.

"Minister Dlamini, her family and senior officials in her ministry and SASSA's leadership must undergo a lifestyle and forensic audit by the auditor-general and law enforcement agencies to determine if there is a corrupt relationship with CPS. If this is found to be so, they must be charged, arrested, assets seized and prosecuted," COSATU added. eNCA

Students angry over NSFAS funding take protest to Durban streets

URBAN – Hundreds of aggrieved University of South Africa (UNISA) students in KwaZulu-Natal took to the streets on Thursday afternoon to protest against ongoing problems with funding and registration.

Students began their protest at the university, but soon reached parts of the inner city, including city hall and the provincial ANC's offices.

Students there dust bins and dirt onto the roads during bustling afternoon traffic.

Police had initially attempted to break up the group, but this proved unsuccessful. When the group got to the ANC offices, police were more forceful, with one metro police officer ordering protesters to demonstrate across the road from the offices.

"You have trashed the city enough.
You must go across the road," he said.

The students, however, insisted they were being mistreated by the education system. One student told News24: "We are poor. We wait outside here day and night and they tell us nothing. How can they treat us this way? This is not the SA we want." Earlier on Thursday UNISA SRC President Zandile Sodladla did not mince her words when she met with a large media contingent after a cancelled meeting with the National

Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS).

Sodladla said mass injustices had been committed against students because NSFAS and, to a lesser extent, university management were dragging their feet in funding students.

According to Sodladla, registration funding had not been activated for many. She said returning and new students were not allowed to register because they did not have funding from NSFAS and, therefore, could not pay the fees required.

Meanwhile, NSFAS spokesperson Kagisho Mamabolo had earlier told News24 that all students who qualify for NSFAS funding must be allowed to register and attend classes at all universities.

He said Universities South Africa, the Department of Higher Education and NSFAS agreed to allow qualifying students to register without payment. The university issued a statement saying re-registering students would be allowed "to fully register for the 2018 academic year before the NSFAS funding process has been completed".

The university said only students who submitted registration by February 2 would be registered and that those registrations would be confirmed by February 14. News24

'Ramaphosa in talks with Zuma'

OHANNESBURG - ANC communicators are keeping mum on where top six leaders, who failed to arrive at various events in Cape Town yesterday morning.

It is déjà vu as the Luthuli House spin machinery goes faulty on journalists in Cape Town, and in turn speculation gains traction that an emergency NEC meeting has been called for today.

It has been confirmed that the top six ANC officials have left for Johannesburg from Cape Town.

Political reporters and journalists are venting out their frustrations on different social media platforms about the ruling party's indifferent reaction to their protestations

Seceretary general Ace Magashule, spokesperson Pule Mabe and communications manager Khusela Sangoni have not responded or yet issued a statement. It is, however, understood and based on confirmation from Western Cape provincial leadership that the national leaders from Luthuli House will be holding an emergency meeting within 24 hours.



Guinea reports Lassa fever death

CONAKRY - Authorities in Guinea announced the first death from Lassa fever in more than two decades on Thursday, heightening anxiety about another hemorrhagic fever in the West African country where an Ebola epidemic first emerged. The Ebola outbreak in late 2013 went on to kill more than 11 000 people in part because local authorities and the international community were slow to act when cases first popped up in a rural part of the deeply impoverished nation. In a government statement, health authorities confirmed that at least one person was dead and more than two dozen others had been monitored for possible symptoms. AP

Fight counterfeit products assistance

LAGOS - The Japanese Government has pledged to assist Nigeria in its fight against substandard and counterfeit products in the country. Taku Miyazaki, the Trade Commissioner, Japan External Trade Organisation (JETRO) made this pledge while speaking with the News Agency of Nigeria (NAN) in Lagos. Miyazaki said consumers and investors needed to be protected from the negative impact of counterfeiting, which had destroyed the economy, business investments and international trade relationships. According to him, his government will collaborate with relevant government agencies in Nigeria to boost capacity of personnel through various workshops to detect fake and substandard products and protect intellectual property African News Agency

NIGERIA'S PRESIDENT WARNS TOGO ABOUT POLITICAL INSTABILITY

BUJA - Nigeria's President Muhammadu Buhari warned about the dangers of political unrest as he met the new envoy from Togo, where there has been a wave of anti-government protests.

Buhari did not specifically mention Togo as he received the newly appointed ambassador, Lene Dimban, at the presidential villa in the capital, Abuja.

But according to his office, the president said "peaceful transitions" in Africa were now non-negotiable, because political crises had a drastic effect on the economy and people. The West African bloc ECOW-AS was working "to prevent political transitions from snowballing into a crisis so that citizens in the region can focus their energies and

resources rather than trying to survive political upheavals," he was quoted as saying.

Buhari became president in 2015 in a peaceful handover of power

after becoming the first opposition candidate in Nigerian history to defeat a sitting president.

Togo's President Faure Gnassingbe has faced an almost weekly round of anti-government protests since late August last year, calling for political change and for his resignation. A coalition of 14 opposition parties wants the introduction of a two-term limit for presidents, in line with the majority of countries in the region. Gnassingbe has been in power since 2005 and is now in his third term of office, after taking over as president from his father, General Gnassingbe Eyadema, who himself ruled Togo for 38 years.

The opposition wants the limit on presidential mandates to be retroactive, to prevent Gnassingbe standing for re-election in 2020 and 2025.

Mediators from Ghana and Guinea have announced that talks will take place between the two sides in Togo's capital, Lome, on February 15.

Nigerian government official with 86 cars charged with fraud

BUJA – A Nigerian government official found with 86 new luxury cars was charged with fraud on Thursday, court papers showed.

Ibrahim Tumsah, Finance and Account Director at the Power, Works and Housing Ministry was arraigned at Abuja Federal High Court along with his brother, Tijani Tumsah - a member of a presidential committee on initiatives in the country's north east.

Both were accused of "refusing" to declare the assets "without rea-

sonable excuse" and after being given notice by a special presidential investigation panel tasked with the recovery of public property.

Besides the cars, their assets include four houses and a quarry plant in Abuja. Another court in December had ordered that all the property in question be temporarily seized.

Tumsah and his brother were granted bail after they pleaded not guilty to the charges.

The court has adjourned the case to March 1.

99-year-leases 'now bankable, transferable - official

HARARE – Zimbabwe's Reserve Bank Governor, John Mangudya, has reportedly said that local banks have agreed to finance farmers after government tweaked the country's 99-year land leases to be "transferable and bankable".

According to the state-owned Herald newspaper, farmers were now going to be able to use their farms as collateral when taking loans, following the landmark development set to change the agricultural sector. The southern African country's financial institutions were previously refusing to borrow money to farmers, arguing that they were not transferable in the event that the farmers were unable to repay their loans.

But following talks with government, the Reserve Bank of Zimbabwe and the bankers, it was agreed that the 99-year-leases were now bankable

"In line with the current economic dispensation's aspirations to transform agriculture into viable business proposition and taking into account the significant improvements made by government on the 99-year leases to enhance the security of tenure of the lease and making it bankable and transferable, the [Reserve] Bank has agreed with banking institutions for them to accept the 99-year-leases as security for accessing credit from financial institutions in line the provisions of the leases," Mangudya was quoted as saying. He said that if government decided to take someone's farm, the banking institutions as financiers would be compensated. This came a week after Zimbabwe's white farmers said that they remained cautious over the new country's new land policy, which now allowed them to lease the land for 99 years. News24

Zimbabwe's top opposition party hurt by power struggles

ARARE - Power struggles are ravaging Zimbabwe's main opposition party months before the election as party leader Morgan Tsvangirai seeks cancer treatment in neighbouring South Africa.

Three deputies are vying to act as MDC-T party leader in Tsvangirai's absence. Spokesperson Luke Tamborinyoka told reporters that Tsvangirai remains unwell but will return to the country "soon". The spokesperson described those interested in succeeding him as "political vultures."

The 65-year-old Tsvangirai has dominated opposition politics for close to two decades as the leading voice against former president Robert Mugabe, who resigned under pressure in November.

The upcoming election will be the first without Mugabe, who led the southern African country for 37 years. The opposition is scrambling to counter new President Emmerson Mnangagwa, a longtime Mugabe ally who has vowed that the election will be free and fair as he seeks to re-engage the international community after years of sanctions over alleged human rights abuses.

Tamborinyoka on Wednesday announced that Tsvangirai had appointed deputy Nelson Chamisa to act as party leader until his return. But other party members are disputing that, saying deputy Elias Mudzuri, who was acting leader before the announcement, or deputy Thokozani Khupe is acting leader or rightful heir.

An opposition alliance has endorsed Tsvangirai as its presidential candidate. But his condition appeared to have deteriorated when he met Mnangagwa in January.

The opposition infighting could come as a gift to Mnangagwa as he seeks to stay in power.

Is it ok to insult the king? Dutch MPs debate law change

on Thursday debated scrapping 19th-century laws making it a criminal offence to insult the king, with backers of a Draft Bill saying they no longer fit a "modern monarchy"

But the issue is a hot-button topic in the Netherlands where the royal family is much loved, and the downto-earth King Willem-Alexander has proved as popular as his mother, former queen Beatrix, since he succeeded to the throne in 2013.

The lowlands nation of 17 million people remains one of the few countries to still maintain "lese majeste" laws, under which it is a criminal offence to insult or defame the monarch. But the Draft Bill put for-

ward by the progressive D66 party, a member of the ruling coalition, is causing fissures in the fragile fourparty ruling alliance first deemed a crime in 1830, the law banning defamation of the head of the royal

household has been on the Dutch statute books since 1886.

But today it "implies restricting freedom of speech," argued D66 MP Kees Verhoeven in his Draft Bill, first put forward in early 2016.

"Since 1830, 185 years have gone by. That's a good reason to update changes to the legislation," he said.

"Time has run out for this law," Socialist deputy Ronald van Raak argued in the chamber.

"Legislation should make no distinction between insulting the king and insulting your neighbour," he added, insisted that freedom of speech "must trump the king's sensibilities". The law is seldom invoked however, and carries a maximum of five years in jail or a penalty of nearly 20,000 euros (\$24,500).

Last used in July 2016, a man was jailed for 30 days for insulting Willem-Alexander on Facebook, calling him a "murderer, thief and rapist". AFP

The 50-year-old appeared on national television to admit his marriage had broken down after Sydney's Daily Telegraph splashed a picture of his 33-year-old pregnant lover on its front page on Wednesday.

The pair are believed to have "participated in the detention, exploitation and execution of Western detainees," the official said in a statement. The two were also "believed to have acted as guards and interpreters involved in ISIS' illegal captivity of Western hostages, and are thought to have links to the British terrorist often called



German daily Bild say Reus had targeted the away game at Borussia Moenchengladbach on February 18 – but he might feature sooner than planned.

"Marco trained normally over the week, we know he wants to play, and he knows that we would like to have him in," said Stoeger on Thursday.

"We will make a decision at short notice." While Dortmund are reluctant to rush the injuryprone Reus back into action, the attacking midfielder is keen to find form and fitness four months out from the World Cup in Russia.

A string of injuries have restricted him to 29 international appearances and nine goals for Germany.

Injuries

Injuries have seen him miss the last two major international tournaments. An ankle injury suffered in the final warm-up game ruled the fleet-footed playmaker out of eventual champions Germany's 2014 World Cup in Brazil.

He then missed the finals of Euro 2016 with a persistent groin injury. *AFP*

Relaxed Serena ready for Fed Cup comeback

SHEVILLE - Serena Williams returns to tennis after a year-long absence today, with all eyes on the former world number one as she sets out on her quest to reclaim her position at the pinnacle of her sport.

The 36-year-old superstar has not played a competitive match since winning the last of her 23 Grand Slam titles at the Australian Open last year, where she was in the early stages of pregnancy.

Since giving birth to her daughter Alexis Olympia in September, Williams has played only once, in an exhibition match in Abu Dhabi in December, where she lost to French Open champion Jelena Ostapenko.

Williams had initially targeted last month's Australian Open for a comeback, but abandoned that ambitious goal after declaring she was not "where I personally want to be".

Competitive

Instead, she will get her first taste of competitive tennis when the United States kick off the defence of their Fed Cup crown against the Netherlands at Asheville, North Carolina.

Williams heads a powerful US team that includes her elder sister, and eighth-ranked, Venus, world number 17 CoCo Vandeweghe as well as world number 62 Lauren Davis.

The tie opens with two singles rubbers today followed by reverse singles tomorrow, with doubles as the fifth rubber if required. US captain Kathy Rinaldi said the Fed Cup was the perfect venue for Williams to launch her comeback.

"She's been out, becoming a new mom, and she's looking to get back into playing," Rinaldi said. "We saw her play an exhibition at the end of last year, but this is a great way for her to start the year and get a couple matches or a match behind her. AFP

US soccer to choose new president after SWC debacle

RLANDO - Evolution or revolution? Football in the United States faces a potentially pivotal leadership election today in a hotlycontested ballot that could have far-reaching ramifications for the game.

Four months after the United States' shock failure to qualify for the 2018 World Cup, the inquest into what went wrong continues to dog American soccer.

In the aftermath of that crushing setback, United States Soccer Federation President Sunil Gulati opted to step down.

Succeed

Now a crowded field of eight candidates are vying to succeed Gulati, with some contenders vowing a wide-ranging shakeup of the way soccer is run in the United States while others preach continuity.

The new president will be elected by a pool of delegates drawn from various constituencies across US soccer.

These include the 91 state associations, national associations and professional leagues, members of the Athletes Council, members of the USSF Board of Directors, past presidents and life members.

So far no candidate has emerged as the overwhelming front-runner, although Kathy Carter, the president of the USSF's promotional partner Soccer United Marketing, has made a late charge, according to media reports.



Around 3 000 athletes from 93 countries have packed out the South Korean city of Pyeongchang for a Games that appears to have every-

After the athletes paraded, the Olympic symbol was created via augmented reality as snowboarders raced down a hill to form the iconic five rings.

Then the flame entered the stadium and was passed around tby Korea's top athletes - including members of the unified ice hockey team - as the torch was lit by famed ice skater Yuna Kim.

Then came the obligatory huge firework display - and that was the signal that Pyeongchang had truly

Before Pita Taufatofua of Tonga was the star of the show - coming out in just a grass skirt despite temperatures in the minus 20s.

Then Tongan did the very same thing for the 2016 Summer Games in Brazil - although it was a little warmer there.

Then there was a huge roar when the unified Korean team emerged - with joint flag bearers from North and South - to floods of emotion from the crowd.

They came out after the British team who waved to the crowd and loudly whooped as they made their way around the stadium.

But before all that started there was dancing and drumming, in fact lots of drumming, as performers arranged themselves into a Yin-Yang South Korean flag to the delight of the crowd.

Then after the national anthem, the athletes began flowing in.

In Turkey, 'crazy' welcome awaits foreign football stars dropped to the bench for the win over

STANBUL - It's a common sight that has become a ritual. A foreign player set to sign for a Turkish side steps blearyeyed into the arrivals hall at Istanbul airport to be greeted by a raucous welcome from thousands of fans.

Slogans are chanted as if in a trance, flares let off and the player battles through the hordes of selfie-taking fans before being bundled into the sanctuary of a waiting car.

It's a baptism of fire for the large numbers of European and Latin American stars who have arrived to ply their trade in the Super Lig. in recent years, attracted by high wages, low taxes and a competitive league.

"People abroad must just say to themselves, 'what is this country of crazy people?" laughed Ayhan Guner, a leader of the Carsi, the best known fan group from Istanbul's Besiktas.

"It's simple -- for us football is sacred. We go to the stadium as some others go on a pilgrimage," he told AFP.

Supporters fondly remember some of the most celebrated welcomes, such as that laid on by Fenerbahce fans for Brazilian striker Alex in 2004, by Galatasaray supporters for Didier Drogba and Wesley Sneijder in 2013 and for Ricardo Quaresma at Besiktas.

Last summer's transfer window marked a new peak for the practice with the likes of Bafetimbi Gomis (Galatasaray), Mathieu Valbuena (Fenerbahce) and Pepe (Besiktas) given ear-splitting receptions on arrival.

"I can't explain it. It was something crazy," recalled former Besiktas striker Pascal Nouma, a Frenchman, who was welcomed by thousands at the airport when he arrived in Istanbul in 2000.

'Isco exit rumours all lies'

ADRID - Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane has branded a report saying he wants to sell Spain midfielder Isco as "lies".

"I have full faith in my team. I am one of those people who, when I start something, I go with it to the death. I believe in what I do, and I want Isco to stay here his whole life," Zidane said at a press conference yesterday ahead of this weekend's home clash with Real Sociedad in La Liga.

"Isco is a very good player. It is a lie, and I am answering in order to put an end to this," added the Frenchman of the Spanish media report which claimed he had asked Real President Florentino Perez to find a buyer for the 25-year-old at the end of this campaign.

That has led to inevitable speculation in England that Isco - who came off the bench for Gareth Bale and scored Real's second goal in their 2-2 draw at Levante last weekend - could be bound for the Premier League. "We have 25 players and everyone is important. Perhaps Isco won't play every game but I am counting on him," said Zidane. His team are currently fourth in La Liga ahead of today's match at the Santiago Bemabeu, which serves first and foremost as a rehearsal for next Wednesday's crunch Champions League last 16, first leg at home to Paris Saint-Germain.

The reigning Spanish and European cham pions are no longer in the running to defend their title in La Liga, in which they have won just two of their last six games and sit/19 points behind leaders Barcelona, albeit game in hand. AFP

Van Dijk back at Saints



The Shukuma football initiative is designed to promote this and the tinkhundla will be the nurturing grounds. Speaking at a recent award ceremony, I encouraged private sector support for the development of futsal, the Spanish equivalent of five-a-side soccer, at grassroots.

It was what Pele, Messi and Ronaldo played exclusively as youngsters and accounts for their close-quarter dribbling skills. This could be the key to filling the Sihlangu trophy Cabinet in future years," the Premier writes.

Dlamini also lauds the contribution of His Majesty King Mswati III in the development of football in the country.

"His Majesty has launched the King's Super Cup and the Ingwenyama Cup to raise the profile of the game with increased competition. MTN, SwaziBank and the MVA have sponsored t o p




