

VICTOR GAMEDZE ASSASSINATION:

King informed about Gamedze's assassination

THE tragic death of top businessman Victor 'Maradona' Gamedze has been officially reported to Their Majesties.

This was gathered at Gamedze's Mbabane home yesterday during a meeting for family members to discuss the logistics of both the memorial service and the funeral.

The slain business giant and well known soccer administrator will be laid to rest at his parental homestead at KaLanga, outside Siteki on Sunday morning after a memorial service to be held at the Prince of Wales Stadium in Mbabane on Saturday.

A relative confided in this newspaper yesterday that the family had formally reported Gamedze's brutal death to the country's author-

This was also confirmed by the presence of Deputy Chief Protocol Officer in the King's Office Khandlela Mdluli at Gamedze's residence yesterday. Mdluli attended the family meeting and is believed to have passed a specific message from the country's authorities to the Gamedze family.

Mdluli is also actively involved in the preparations of the memorial service and the funeral. After the meeting behind closed doors with family members, Mdluli then travelled to the Prince of Wales Stadium with a family delegation for the planning of the service.

The team also comprised family lawyer Sdumo Mdladla and Mbabane Swallows coach Thabo 'Koki' Vilakati.

The crew was overheard discussing logistics of the memorial service and brainstorming on the location of the stage, the parking and other issues.

There was a suggestion that the car wash next to the stadium should be closed on Saturday, to allow cars to park there. The police will also be roped in to control traffic and maintain order during what will undoubtedly be one of the biggest memorial services.

The mood was still sombre at the prestigious Gamedze homestead yesterday as scores of mourners continued to pour in to deliver their condolences. Traffic on Imfuyo Street, which is the street leading to Gamedze's home in the Dalriach suburbs, is becoming a nightmare with each passing day.

Residents who are neighbours to the Gamedze home now have difficulty travelling between their homes due to the heavy traffic. Some abandoned their cars on the main road and walked on foot to their homes.

DAY 3: Still no arrest

THE Royal Swaziland Police Service (RSP) has still not made any breakthrough in connection with the assassination of businessman Victor Gamedze.

Today is the third day since Gamedze's fatal shooting and there are still no arrests made.

Police Chief Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed that nobody had been arrested in connection with the killing of the business guru.

"Intensive investigations are still on-going," he said.

Despite circulating rumours that two businessmen and a socialite had been questioned about the incident, the police have refused to confirm this. Superintendent Mamba said the police were not at liberty to inform the public about who they had questioned in relation to a case.

Mamba further refuted reports that some police officers involved in the investigation of the case leaked CCTV video footage showing the killing of Gamedze.

"I have talked to the officers involved in the investigation and they say none of them leaked that video. As things stand, the person who leaked the video remains unknown," he said.

Conversely, the person who shot and killed Gamedze remains unknown.

MURDERED businessman Victor Gamedze predicted and knew that he would be killed.

Addressing journalists at Gamedze's home in Dalriach yesterday, long time friend and associate, Bongani Mamba said the businessman had, over a long period of time, informed him that there were people who wanted to assassinate

"He would call time and again to share his fears with me. He would sometimes mention people's names. He saw it coming but did not believe in bodyguards because he believed he was nobody's enemy," said a sombre Mamba when addressing journalists.

"On Sunday morning, before we went to Somhlolo, he called and we spoke for nine minutes and he mentioned names again of people whom he suspected were plotting to kill him. I won't mention names," he said.

PREPARATIONS for the memorial service of slain businessman Victor Gamedze are already underway.

Gamedze's memorial will be held on Saturday at the Prince of Wales Sports Ground in Mbabane.

Prominent people in the country were seen at the Prince of Wales planning on how the memorial service would be carried out. King's Office Deputy Protocol Officer Khandlela Mdluli, lawyer Sidumo Mdladla and Mbabane Swallows coach Thabo 'Koki' Vilakati were among the people who were found discussing how the memorial service could be carried out. They were later joined by Mbabane Swallows Captain Tony Tsabedze.

Hlophe family shattered: Gamedze looked after us

THE death of businessman Victor Gamedze has not only left business people and soccer administrators shocked.

Ordinary members of the society have also been negatively affected by the death of the shrewd businessman.

One such is Gugu Matsenjwa from Mahlangatsha in the Manzini region.

iscijwa encountered an unfortunate incident when her brother, Phillip Hlophe and his wife were knocked down by a car from MVTel, a communications company owned by Gamedze. Hlophe and Matsejwa share the same mother. The incident happened in 2004 in Mankayane, according to Matsenjwa. Upon hearing that his company car had knocked down the couple, Gamedze took it upon himself to shoulder the funeral expenses. He went to the Hlophe family in Mahlangatsha where the apol-

ogised for the terrible incident. offered to shoulder all the funeral expenses.

Gamedze, at that time, was with Prosper Mpofu and other managers from MVTel.

"Gamedze did not end there. He went on to help even after the funeral, where he took care of us and the children. When we had problems, we went straight to him and he helped us. He never got tired of us," Matsenjwa said.

Compensated

The businessman also helped them with the processes of receiving compensation from the Sincephetelo Motor Vehicle Accident Fund (SMVAF).

However, efforts to get the compensation proved futile as they were allegedly not helped.

But Gamedze, according to Matsenjwa, had tried his level best to ensure they got the money.

He is said to have even acquired the services of top lawyer Sidumo Mdladla, but it could not help.

When Gamedze started helping the

family, the children belonging to the slain couple had not even started at pre-

This year, the children are supposed to be completing their high school education. Matsenjwa was supposed to meet Gamedze last Wednesday, but didn't because he was busy and could not attend to her

"His personal assistant (PA) suggested that I should return to the office next week (this week) because he was in a meeting at the time," she added.

She wanted help from Gamedze so that her family could buy school uniforms for the children and satisfy the other needs of the family. She was doing all this on behalf of Mariah Simelane, her mother, who could not do all these things because she was ageing.

Matsenjwa said they were very saddened by the loss of Gamedze and she sent words of condolences to his family, his friends and relatives.

the police headquarters in Mbabane to sign affidavits relating to threats that Gamedze had received.

"Before Christmas, we were called to the police headquarters to write affidavits regarding an article carried by a certain publication. The police had more information even before the incident which they could have used to take swift action," Mamba stated.

He stressed that he was not complaining about the police but merely saying they should be responsible and take action on information provided to them.

"Now that this (assassination) has happened, we are saying the police should use the information that was given to them in investigating the matter," Mamba added.

He said there were SMSes that Gamedze showed him and the police.

"We don't care who eventually pulled the trigger because those people were hired but we care about the information that the police have but are not using," he said. Contacted on the allegations Police mouthpiece Superintendent Khulani Mamba said in their files they have a matter that was reported by Gamedze to the police regarding a newspaper that has been shut down.

"It is unfortunate that I cannot go into details of what was reported but what I can tell you is that the police launched investigations. The police were still investigating the matter when Gamedze met his death," Mamba said briefly.

Gamedze was assassinated on Sunday at the Galp Filling Station at Ezulwini by an unknown man who was in the company of others. He was pronounced dead on arrival at MedSun Clinic.

He was from Somhlolo National Stadium where his team Mbabane Swallows played against Manzini Wanderers and won 1-0.

Free airtime, sim cards was a farewell - Ingatja

The gesture cost the company over E200 000.

"Our take is that God wanted Gamedze to bid us farewell and sent him to give us the free airtime and sim cards because he knew he was going to take him away from us. We are sad to have lost someone who was an initiated member of

the regiments and someone who never forgot where he came from," said one ingatja with teary eyes.

Another said he felt for the family and the people employed in all of Gamedze's business ventures.

"The family and workers must come together and form a formidable force. They have a duty to ensure that the vision that Gamedze had lives on. The death of Gamedze left many of us etihoncweni shattered," said another ingatia.

CCTV footage of Victor's execution gets 400 views on YouTube

THE leaked CCTV footage of businessman Victor Gamedze being gunned down at a Galp Filling Station has made its way to YouTube.

YouTube is known as an American video-sharing website which has its headquarters in San Bruno, California. This social media platform allows users to upload, view, rate, share, add to favourites, report, comment on videos, and subscribe to other users. By yesterday afternoon the video had over 400 views.

The last moments of the business mogul even though they were horrifying, were posted for everyone to see on YouTube.

Some members of the public were not happy with the video and pictures of Gamedze going viral as they stated that it is disturbing for the family and it will be traumatic for the deceased's children.

However, some had different views. A social media user explained

that the police might have leaked the video on purpose so that they can speed up investigations.

The user said when a video is leaked to the public there are high chances that someone might notice something that can help in identifying the suspects.

By yesterday, people who had access to the leaked video were already coming up with their own theories on who might be involved basing this on the people who were spoted on camera.

Some even went to the extent of pointing an accusing finger at the old man who was spotted closely following Gamedze and talking to him moments before he was gunned down. Most of those who watched the video on YouTube expressed shock on how such could happen in broad daylight.

Some Facebook users claimed that they have pictures of the suspects. Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba expressed disappointment over the leaked CCTV footage.

CEO mourns Gamedze's death

These were the words of Hlatikulu Chief Executive Officer Bongani Dlamini when reacting to the death of businessman Victor Gamedze. "It's something I did not believe when I first saw the news circulating on social media. I then contacted a police officer I know on that Sunday who confirmed the sad news," Dlamini said.

Dlamini said even Hlatikulu was still looking forward to benefiting from the hardworking Gamedze. "My condolences go to his fam-

y.
"I think the town board is still

to meet to pass its condolences to the family of the fallen giant," said the long serving CEO of Hlatikulu.

Former Shiselweni Regional Football Association long serving executive member Aaron Mhlanga also passed his condolences to the Gamedze family.

"It's a great loss not just for football but for all sectors.

"His death has touched many," Mhlanga said.

Mfeneziyamtfoba Magagula, the outspoken Hlatikulu resident said he was in pain and never believed at first when he heard about Gamedze's death.

"We feel sorry for the country's leaders as he was a person who was still to contribute to the country's Vision 2022.

"May all those behind this be caught and face the consequences for their actions. If things could be done my way, all those responsible would be apprehended and killed. They should not be spared as they did not spare Gamedze's life," Magagula said.

SRAWORKERS RETURN TO WORK

AFTER engaging in a strike action for over a month, employees of the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) returned to work yesterday.

All staffers were busy in their different workstations yesterday. The SRA headquarters in Mbabane, which had become very quiet in recent times, was a hive of activity yesterday as workers from different departments went about their respective duties.

The strike action was suspended by the Swaziland Revenue Authority Workers Union (SRAWU) after the intervention of the Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula last week.

The workers were demanding a 6.5 per cent salary raise on top of the 6.8 per cent that had already been offered by the authority.

SRAWU's Secretary General Moses Masilela, in a brief interview yesterday, confirmed that all staffers had returned to work. "All I can say is that we returned to work as agreed with our members over the weekend. THE Pigg's Peak branch of the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) was operational yesterday after temporally ceasing operations since mid-December.


The branch was closed following SRA's employees strike over wages. Speaking to this publication yesterday after finding SRA offices in Pigg's Peak open, members of the Pigg's Peak business community said they were happy to start balancing their books.

"I am happy that SRA is back in business, as a business owner, I often use January as the month to consolidate all my business accounts.

After doing that, I then see how much money I have to pay in taxes. I feel like it is better to pay taxes at the beginning of the year so that your business does not suffer any long term tax problems. When the SRA was not operational, I was worned that I will not get the chance to pay my taxes on time," said a bussiness owner.

Another business owner said he approached the SRA building in Pigg's Peak around December only to find that the offices were closed.

"Unfortunately, I had originally planned to visit the SRA offices in Pigg's Peak during December, but due to the recent strike action, I

could not get any service now I hope that the strike action is over so that I can continue working as normal," he said. MINISTER of education and training Phineas Magagula says all systems are in place for the schools opening next week.

Schools using the government calendar will be opening next Tuesday.

In a telephonic interview yesterday, the minister confirmed that furniture for the 148 newly built classes was readily available.

He advised school principals to do a requisition with their Regional Education Offices (REO).

Magagula said principals should make

it their responsibility to approach the REO and request for furniture. "The furniture is readily available it is a matter of principals approaching the REO office and placing their requisition," he said

The ministry of education built 148 classes for both primary and secondary school levels.

He said they had realised that the number of primary school pupils was increasing with each year and something had to be done to absorb them.

The minister added that when building the classes, quite a number of factors were considered including the population in that region.

Following the introduction of the Free Primary Education (FPE) programme the enrolment at primary level increased resulting in classes at secondary level being overcrowded.

He said the ministry conducted a needs assessment study to address the issue of the increasing enrolment at primary and it was concluded and recommended that more classes in different secondary schools be constructed, including the establishment of new secondary schools all together.

Magagula said following this assessment and recommendations, government built new classrooms in the four regions of the country.

'Zondle' also available for schools' opening

MINISTER of Education and Training Phineas Magagula said the schools' feeding scheme, commonly known as 'zondle' will be available as soon schools open.

The minister said the feeding scheme programme had been budgeted for by government and as soon as schools open, the ministry will start with the distributions.

Magagula said because someone has to sign for the food parcels upon delivery, the distribution will not take place while schools are closed instead it will come size when the term begins next week. "The food should be received by someone who will sign and acknowledge that it has been received," he said

He further mentioned the available food includes maize meal, rice, beans and other necessities that constitute 'zondle'. He said parents and teachers should not panic as the ministry has made sure that food is available to all schools benefiting under the programme.

He further reminded the media that in the 'Zondle' programme they work with National Emergency Response Council on HIV and AIDS (NER- CHA). "Thus far they have not reported anything that may hinder the delivery of food at schools," he said.

He said teachers in the meantime can use leftovers for the first day of school. "Trucks will deliver food on the first day and head teachers have been made aware of this development," he stated. Meanwhile, the minister said for Free Primary Education (FPE) money, principals should check with the treasury department. "I am also going to make a follow up in order to know if the cheques are readily available," he said.

services, refuse collection and their safety in general. Road upgrading and rehabilitation is a vital part of the Council's annual activities.

Following the heavy rains, a number of roads were severely affected- namely Meintjies Road leading out of the main bus rank and Stanley Road in Ngwane Park. The Council is pleased to report that Meintjies Road has been attended to. The potholes were filled Friday and work on Stanley Road has begun. Residents should be aware that the process of filling potholes requires that first they be filled with gravel then followed by bitumen after the gravel is compacted. Therefore the gravel filled potholes in Stanley are the first phase before they are filled with bitumen.

FATAL ACCIDENT **BUS DRIVER** APPEARS IN COURT

DAVID Dlamini (55), the driver for Tit For Tat Bus Service yesterday made his first court appearance before the Magistrate's Court.

The bus he drove was involved in a fatal accident along the Lonhlupheko-Manzini road last November. One passenger died while undergoing treatment at Mbabane Government Hospital while about 20 others were admitted to various hospitals after sustaining serious injuries. The driver was amongst those who were admitted for several days at the hospital as he also sustained injuries. Appearing before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso yesterday, Dlamini faced a charge of culpable homicide.

He is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully driven the motor vehicle in a negligent,

subsequently losing control of it when it went off the roadway before ramming into a ditch. particulars of the offence include that the accused person failed to apply brakes timeously to avoid the accident from occurring. He is said to have been driving at a high speed and without due care.

The accused person repre-

sented himself before the court. Prosecutor Thobile Motsa told the court that the accused person was not held in custody due to his injuries. She applied for a date for commencement of the

Suspect wanted for attempted murder




BUSINESS AS USUAL: Some of the vendors going about their work at the market place yesterday.

THE University of Swaziland (UNISWA) has called upon all students who still owe fees to settle their accounts with the institution soon.

Astatement released by the UNISWA Registrar Dr. Salebona Simelane reads; "It is advised that students who owe University fees should settle their accounts with immediate effect".

The registrar added in an interview that this refers to students who not only owe fees from the first semester but also those who owe any previous fees to the universi-

When asked on the issue of the release of first semester results. Simelane said there is still no definite date that has been agreed upon on the release of results.

"We hope the senate will consider the results this week, only after such a meeting can it be determined when results can be released," he said.

The release of first semester results is closely followed by the commencement of the second semes-

"The commencement of classes is determined by the release of results, followed by the registering of students and only then can classes start," said Simelane.

Simelane added that the university is hopeful that classes would start on the last week of January. We hoping that classes will resume on January 29,"



Swaziland Shopping was a mistake - Minister

MINISTER for Information, Communication and Technology (ICT) Dumisani Ndlangamandla said the continued operation of Swaziland Shopping was an irregularity.

Ndlangamandla, when called on the matter, said all he knew was that the newspaper was closed because the registration requirements were never met. He said the newspaper should not have been allowed to operate without a licence.

"The operation of the newspaper with-

out a licence was an irregularity," Ndlangamandla said.

When asked if the newspaper would be allowed to operate after meeting the requirements, the minister simply said the ministry had officials whose job it was to issue newspaper licences.

He pleaded with those concerned to give the licencing officials a chance to do their job because they knew it better than anyone.

He did not want to commit himself any further on the issue, in fear of being seen as someone who interfered on their job. "We do not want government to be seen as interfering in the job done



by the officials," he said.

The minister said he never, at any point in time spoke to the editor of the closed ewspaper Martin Dlamini on the issue the newspaper.

This comes after Dlamini alleged Dlamini reportedly fled to South that he was alerted by the minister Africa fearing arrest as he claimed on the pending closure on instructions from above.

"He once made an appointment with me. He wanted to talk about a different story, but unfortunately, I got engaged in other duties on the day we were supposed to meet," the minister said. They had to shift their appointment to another day and unfortunately, the issue of the newspaper ensued.

Dlamini's publication was shut down in December after the ministry revealed that he had failed to comply with the Books and Newspaper Act No.20 of 1963. After the closure of the publication,

there was a warrant for his arrest.

The newspaper was closed despite the fact that a sum of E15 000 was paid to the ministry of ICT when the licence application for the newspaper was made by Editor Zweli Martin Dlamini.

However, Ministry of ICT Principal Secretary Bhekithemba Gama explained, in an article printed by his newspaper last month, that the E15 000 was a pre-requisite when applying and payment of it did not necessarily mean automatic registration hence in the event one's application was unsuccessful the payment was reversed.


AFTER being roasted on social media over the weekend, Manzini North Member of Parliament (MP) Jan Sithole has responded by saying he is content with being criticised because he holds a leadership position.

Sithole was subjected to criticism on popular social networking site Facebook where he was accused of failing to formulate policies to bring democratic changes to the country.

He said people were free to express their opinions even though he felt some opinions do not deserve to be responded to.

"Some opinions expressed sometimes do not deserve to be responded to as some have the audacity to intentionally be naughty and deliberately mischievous.

Being criticised is part of the deal for leadership and public officers and I like it as it complements accountability and



transparency as part of democratic traits," he said.

The lawmaker said some opinions are made out of lack of information.

"That too is healthy for an environment that advocates for enjoyment of the freedom of expression and opinion. However, over time, some opinions and conclusions are baseless and sometimes not or sometimes they cannot be substantiated but still it is good to hear them.

I use such opinions and criticisms as a tool to assess opinions which people have and I pick the positives and improve from there," he said.

Sithole stated that as a democrat and a human rights defender, he is a firm believer in freedom of expression and opinion and he encourages people to use this right as freely as they can.

"I, therefore, am not perturbed if people express opinions including perceptions about me as a public figure. Since time immemorial, I have thrived and improve on criticism I get from commentators.

It is also important to mention that unless one is a member of an organisation political or otherwise, they will not be privy to the strategy, work plan, tactics and priorities of that organisation and opinions and perceptions formulated without these internal insights could be premised on wrong benchmarks

However, all forms of opinions and criticism are good to have and good to hear because any such opinions still add value to the criticised person and/or organisation," he said.

Man arrested for stealing dad's booze

A man has been arrested for stealing alcoholic beverages belonging to his father.

Sifiso Mhlabane broke into his father's apartment at Ntfonjane flats in Mbabane on Sunday and stole three bottles of expensive whiskey valued at close to E1 000.

He stole a bottle of Jameson, Chivas Regal and Black Label. Mhlabane also took his father's camera and a Samsung mobile phone before vacating the flat.

Upon return to his flat in the evening, his father, Mandlenkosi Mhlabane was surprised to notice that his booze and other items were missing from the house. He enquired from neighbours who informed him that they had seen his son entering the house earlier in the day and leaving later in a haste carrying a plastic bag.

He reported to the matter to the police who responded swiftly and commenced intensive investigations. The investigations led the police to Mhlabane's son.

He was arrested later in the evening in town after he had passed out. Yesterday, he appeared before Magistrate Lenhle Zulu on chargesof house breaking with intent to steal. All the items he stole are worth E3 800.

When his rights to legal representation were read to him, he opted to conduct his own defence. He pleaded guilty to the charge and informed the court that he was drunk when he committed the offence was not thinking straight.

"I regret what I did. I was drunk on the day and was not thinking properly.

" I went to see my father but only to find that he was not in the house and it was not locked. I entered the house and stole his

alcohol. The police arrested me in town after I had passed out," he said.

He pleaded with the court to be lenient with him.

"Where is the phone now," the presiding officer enquired. Mhlabane said the gadgets were with the police

Magistrate Zulu also asked where the alcohol was.

"I drank all of it," said the accused person.

This seemed to surprise the Magistrate who wondered how one person could drink three bottles of different whiskey brands.

"You drank all that? You were a big shot in town and entertaining your friends with your father's drinks," said the Magistrate.

Magistrate Zulu warned Mhlabane against alcohol abuse since he was still relatively young.

He was sentenced to 15 months imprisonment.

Swazi, Tanzanian nabbed with E100 000 dagga

A Tanzanian and a Swazi were arrested by Bhunya Police after they were found with dagga weighing 124.25kg with a street value of close to E100 000.

According to a press release by the Royal Swaziland Police (RSP), the two suspects were found in possession of dagga without a permit while driving a Toyota Run X at Mhlabubovu.

The Swazi has only been identified as a man from Hlatikulu. Their names will only be revealed once they have appeared before a Magistrate.

"On Sunday at 2200 hours Bhunya police arrested and charged a 27-year-old man of Hlatikulu and a 31-year-old Tanzanian man for being found in possession of dagga weighing 124.25kg with the street value of E99 400 while driving a Toyota RunX at Mhlabubovu,"

said Mamba.

Meanwhile, a man of Mbabane lost his life when a truck lost control and collided with the car he was driving.

The accident that claimed one life happened near C4 along UP 13 Bhunya/Mgotshane gravel Road. The sources said a Nissan diesel truck lost control and collided with a Toyota Corolla.



Sex with 13-year-old lands man in jail

A 21-year-old man has been arrested for having sex with a 13-year-old girl at SOS Children's Village in Mbabane.

Mduduzi Michael Zulu of Manzana was arrested by police officers from the Mbabane Police Station on Monday. He appeared before the Mbabane Magistrate's Court yesterday charged with contravening section 3(1) of the Girls and Women's Protection Act of 1920. The identity of the victim has been deliberately withheld because she is a minor.

According to the charge sheet, Zulu did on January 2, wrongfully and unlawfully have sexual intercourse with the 13-year-old girl.

In terms of the law, a girl under the age of 16 is not capable of consenting to any sexual activity. The prosecution applied that the accused person be remanded into custody until next week.

In another matter, a man has been fined E1 500 for driving recklessly and crashing into a Nissan X-trail vehicle at the Engene traffic lights in Mbabane. Sandile Penuel Shabangu was also charged with failing to stop at a red traffic light.

He was further slapped with a contempt of court charge after he failed to appear in court on Monday. He pleaded guilty to all the counts. On the contempt of court charge, he pleaded with

the court to be lenient with him and said he thought he was supposed to appear at the Swazi National Court on Monday.

"When Larrived there I discovered that my mat-

"When I arrived there, I discovered that my matter was not on the roll there. I then went to the Mbabane Police Station where I was advised to appear before this court.

"When I arrived here at around noon, I found that the warrant for my arres had already been issued," he said. He also apologised for committing the other offences and said he had pledged to fix the X-trail that he wrecked.

"I also plead with the court to be lenient with me because I am currently unemployed after my contract was not renewed last December. I am currently very broke yet I still have to fix both cars, mine and the X-trail," he said.

He was sentenced to two months imprisonment in respect of the first count or E200 fine. On the second count, he was sentenced to eight months or E800 and on the third count, he was fined E500 or five months.



VICTOR'S DEATH LEAVES SHISELWENI FOLKS DEVASTATED

THE untimely death of businessman Victor 'Maradona' Gamedze has been described by Shiselweni residents as a great loss not just to his family and relatives, but to the whole country.

The Mbabane Swallows boss and Swazi Mobile Chairman was assassinated on Sunday near Galp Filling Station at Ezulwini.

The region's folks said it was shocking to learn about the celebrated football administrator and successful businessman's death.

Swallows Mbabane Chairperson of the Nhlangano branch Barcelona Sibandze, a merchandiser said he could not believe the news as he had seen Gamedze earlier on the day he met his demise.

Sibandze said he learnt about Gamedze's death while returning after watching the quarter -finals at Somhlolo Stadium where Swallows played Manzini Wanderers.

"He was seated in the VIP box with other dignitaries. It was while we were on our way back to Nhlangano when I received a call from a police officer I know informing me about the sad news.

It was hard to believe but another caller called and alerted me with same, I trembled and the other people I was with in the kombi were also devastated," said Sibandze.

Sibandze said Gamedze was almost like a brother to him as each time he had problems especially on anything to do with the branch, the late Gamedze always came up with solutions.

"Just not long ago, Swallows had to travel to Botswana and I was interested in accompanying the team but the challenge I had was getting a travel document.

I alerted one of the officials

who in turn notified Gamedze about the dilemma I was in. He (Gamedze) made arrangements for me and I was able to get the travel document which enabled me to travel to Botswana. He was one person who availed himself even when one was hopeless and he helped them to get strong. I can't even cope with work right now because of his death," said Sibandze who was found at work in Spar.

Samkeliso Dlamini, one of the Managers at Nhlangano Spar, who also happened to be at the scene when Gamedze was gunned down said he was still haunted by what he saw.

A Mbabane Swallows die hard, Dlamini said he had also gone to watch his favourite club on Sunday and also proceeded to Ezulwini after the game.

He said he happened to see Gamedze next to the filling station and never thought a terrible thing would happen to him. Seated

"I saw him at Somhlolo and he was seated with other VIPs. Again, just when I got to Ezulwini I saw him and never thought anything bad would happen to

I was a few metres away when all of a sudden he was attacked and in a split second he was down and then the gunman who had shot him with two bullets was seen running to an already moving vehicle and it sped off with him.

I could not believe what I was seeing.

I still don't feel well as this happened right in front of me. It's a sad scenario that I won't easily forget.

Gamedze's passing is a loss to the whole country in general," said Dlamini.

Samson Nhlengetfwa, one of the security guards at the Spar entrance who has been praised by customers for being professional in the way he treats customers said he had never seen Gamedze in person other than seeing his pictures in the Gamedze," said Simelane.

newspapers but his death also left him shocked.

"The fact that I never had a chance to come across him, it's not important but because he was popular, I was also left devastated when I learned that he was no more. He was a giant who we looked up to in contributing and shaping the country's economy. The whole country has lost a great man," said Nhlengetfwa who wore a sorrowful look.

Shocked

Sifiso Kunene, a businessman in the transport industry who owns kombis said he only heard about the death of Gamedze on Monday morning.

He said he never believed it when he read newspapers stating that he has passed on. "My wife (LaDlamini) used to go to the same school with Victor. She is also shocked and she recalled their years when they were pupils in one of the schools around Lobamba.

There is no doubt that Victor was an anchor in many things including providing jobs to many Swazis as well as his achievements in football.

Our condolences go to his family and also to all Swazis," said Kunene who operates kombis known as Sanele Transport.

Sandile Simelane, a successful farmer said Gamedze's death disoriented him a bit.

He said he never thought something like this could happen to a man who was the 'life and soul' to a number of Swazis whom he had employed and their families benefitted from.

"I was touched and it was something I thought was a hoax. On Monday morning newspapers confirmed what I doubted. The whole country is in mourning.

The nation is also owed an explanation as to why such a great man could lose his life like this. It's sad and it's going to take time to heal the wounds for many Swazis who knew

EUROPEAN BIK SPOTTED IN P. PE

ABOUT 20 senior European touring motorcycle riders have begun the Swazi leg of a month-long tour of Southern Africa.

The riders who are predominantly Danish and Belgian nationals started their tour in Durban last Monday and were spotted in Pigg's Peak refuelling on Saturday.

Speaking to this publication spokesperson of the group, Otto Hanson said it took a ship three-weeks to transport the motorcycles from Italy to Durban where the tour officially started last week.

"We enjoyed riding here in Swaziland, some of our riders have been to Swaziland before on three separate occasions in the past, but most of us are new to the area. Swazi people have been very friendly and supportive to us, they help us with directions and other very important information. Currently in Europe it is the winter season, it is cold and the weather is horrible, to combat this, we decided to re-visit Swaziland where the weather is always sunny and extremely beautiful," he said.


Touring

Hanson said their touring motorcycles travelled by ship from Italy to Durban adding that the ship usually takes three weeks to transport the bikes.

He said they followed their bikes by air travel.

"We usually fly on South African Airways, when we get to the main Durban port, we collect and declare our motorcycles. After this exercise, we then started riding from Durban to Mozambique through Swaziland.

"Then in Mozambique we will ride along the coastal highways that will eventually reconnect us back to South Africa, before returning to Europe plan to ride through the southern part of Botswana and northern Lesotho, during these rides we take in all the beautiful sights and

sounds of the beautiful Southern African continent," he added.

Meanwhile, South African motorcyclist at the Bike House, Andy De Boar said motorcycles are often categorised in three main groups namely super bike, touring bike and cruising bikes.

"You can tell what type of motorcycle you are looking at just by the way the bike rider sits on it. A sports bike has the rider bending forward to reach the low lying handle bars, the bike is built for speed so the rider's body has to be as low as possible to promote good aero dynamics.

Expensive

There were cruisers bikes and these are the Harley Davidson style bikes.

They are often expensive and are built with a lot of chrome, the bike itself has wide slightly tall handle bars, and are built that way so that the rider's back stays upright and comfortable.

The rider's legs are usually in a forward position, this is done so that the bike rider could spend a lot of hours riding the motorcycle.

These bikes are more expensive than built for speed," he said.

most bikes as this segment has a lot of prestige for the bike companies.

There is also the touring bikes which are built for all types of roads; gravel or highways. These bikes are also called scrambler bikes, they have an upright riding position like a cruiser but the rider has to bend his knees slightly behind his body, these bikes are good for all day

Speaking to bike specialist at Carson Wheels in Manzini, Jabulani Ngwenya said cruiser bikes are the most expensive bikes raging from E150 000 all the way up to E500 000.

"Cruiser bikes like your Harley Davisson style bikes are the most expensive because of good branding. Next, the touring bikes come at E200 000 up to E400 000, these are priced that way because they possess off-road capability in some models. Also, they have additional features like a comfortable rear seat as well as heated handle bars, cruise control and a lot of hidden storage bins.

"A super bike starts at E125 000 all the way up to 250 000, these bikes are

Cops happy with newly installed Boxer Supermarket security lights

THE Pigg's Peak police are happy with the new security lights that have been installed around Boxer Supermarket in Pigg's Peak.

The light installation took place last Thursday barely 24 hours after the Swazi Observer reported that Boxer Pigg's Peak did not have adequate security lighting.

According to sources, Pigg's Peak police, under the anti-crime unit had approached Boxer administration way back in 2016 to install the security lights but the request fell on deaf ears at the time.

"The Pigg's Peak police had approached Boxer Supermarket on a multitude of occasions urging them to add security lights, these requests started from 2015 up to

"The Pigg's Peak anti-crime unit held a number of meetings with Boxer administration as well as other businesses in Pigg's Peak to discuss the importance of having proper security lights.

"During these meetings, the media was invited and heard Constable Thulani Gwebu telling all the invited business owners on different occasions that the security lights as well as proper alarm systems will reduce the likelihood of crime because criminals will be reconsider because

of these obstacles," he said.

After countless meetings, the lights have been installed much to the elation of the Pigg's Peak police.

Speaking to this publication on Friday, Pigg's Peak police said the area of concern to them at Boxer was behind the super market.

"In 2017, Boxer Supermarket in Pigg's Peak was burgled twice, on both occasions the criminals used the darkness behind the supermarket to conceal themselves and then climb onto the roof of the supermarket. They used power tools like grinders to cut through the corrugated iron roof tiles to gain successful entry, on both these occasions the lack of proper security lights around the supermarket played a major role in the criminals gaining successful access because nobody on the outside could see what was happening on the inside of the shop. In 2015, criminals broke into Boxer through the roof and blew up a safe, none of these crimes would have happened if the shop had proper security lights that would have inhibited the criminals movements," he

Meanwhile sources at Boxer confirmed the installation of the security lights last Thursday behind and in front to the supermarket.

ADMITS TO ENVELOPS SHORTAGE



November, workers allege to have also been owed some money in respect to salaries which the company failed to pay between September and November. Some workers who spoke to this publication

> ny had promised to pay them the pending salaries before January.

When the workers arrived at the company premises on Monday, they were informed that the company was still not ready to resume operations. The management is said to have reported that the director have stated in no uncertain terms that the company is currently faced with a financial crisis, and was in

no position to resume operations. When reached for comment, Mandla Madonsela who is factory manager confirmed that the company has since closed down indefinitely. Madonsela stated that the management was however working around the clock to address the financial situation. He said the director of the company has reported that he is currently making negotiations with potential investors who would assist the company to rise from its financial problems.

"At this particular point the company has closed down due to reported financial problems. We are however hopeful that it will resume operations in the near future as the director is working tirelessly in roping in investors to partner with," he said. Madonsela further stated that workers would also have another meeting tomorrow to get feedback from the management. The management is also expected to meet with the workers on this day.

BOGUS USDF 'RECRUITER' NABBED BY COPS

A man who for a long time has been going around swindling members of the public by claiming to be a USDF recruiter has been arrested.

It's believed the man who identifies himself as a 'Groening' tricked a number of residents around Nhlangano and other places.

From others he would take clothing on credit especially hawkers and promising to pay them at the end of the month.

It is said others were conned as they were promised jobs as he claimed ties with the army authorities who asked him to go around recruiting those interested in joining the army as there were vacancies left by deceased members. He claimed other vancies were as a result of recruits leaving before they finished the training

The man who would be clad in the army's uniform when going around doing the evil act, took sums of money after he demanded to have it paid in order for the process to be sped up.

"He targeted mostly women especially with relatives looking for jobs. He claimed to be connected with the army authorities and his loyalty resulted in him being 'asked' to go around looking for these people interested in joining the army. He crooked others by telling them that those he would recruit will not even undergo training but go straight to the workstations. Some people who 'bought' his story forked out E10 000 and others E15 000. Other families had to sell their livestock to raise the amount the bogus soldier demanded," a source said.

Some of the residents started getting worried after waiting for months without them or their relatives being called upon by the USDF. The issue was reported to the police. "He would leave all his details and other information on how he could be contacted. Some of the people he provided with contacts that were

nonexistent and to those he gave the correct ones, each time when called, he would either give an excuse of being busy with the process. Sometimes when called, someone else would answer the phone and claimed to not know the person they were looking for," said a source.

One of the victims ran into the bogus soldier last week, and she demanded all the items and money he took from her. Like someone who seemed to have no problem in being taken to the police station to make a statement, it is said the man obliged to come along with the victim to the police station and that was when he got arrested as police all along were looking for him for having conned people. Police mouthpiece Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed that police arrested a man said to be linked in conning people items and money.

"He tricked the victims by claiming to be in the army and many fell for his tricks as they believed him," said Supt. Mamba.

"We understand that the widow (identifying her) was first asked to forward a goat on behalf of her son, but she told the headman that she did not have any.

It was then that she was asked to pay E600 and she also said she did not have that amount of money. She ended up paying E200 as that was an amount she had. The mob upon hearing about this then decided to confront Phakathi to demand an explanation for why he frustrated the widow and why he took money from her," said one of the residents.

COMMENDS UNESCO FOR IMPROVING EDUCATION IN SD

PRIME Minister Dr. Sibusiso Dlamini has commended the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) for helping the country to improve its education system.

Dlamini was speaking on Monday at a ministerial meeting with the UNESCO International Bureau of Education (IBE) on Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD)

The meeting was held at Happy Valley Hotel in Ezulwini.

He said UNESCO had chosen 13 countries for implementation of quality education assessment. Swaziland was among those countries

"We thank the IBE for selecting Swaziland to be amongst the 13 countries to implement the General Education Quality Assessment Framework. The initiative will assess and provide improvement to their education systems," Dlamini

Dlamini said the process of identifying and addressing the gaps in the country's education system would bring the country closer to attaining Vision 2022.

The country, through His Majesty King Mswati III, has set a goal of reaching one of the first world status by 2022.

The premier noted that there were considerable challenges for the country in the implementation of the ECCD.

The challenges included the low degree of access to ECCD, because it was provided mainly by private institutions, relatively expensive, and not free of charge. Furthermore, children were not fed at the ECCD centres and there was also a need for the provision of special training of ECCD personnel. An ECCD Policy is yet to be drawn up.

Gain

Dlamini stated that there was absolutely no doubt of the overall gain from there being an ECCD system in place for all the children of the country.

But what was equally clear was the size of the challenge inherent in the financial feasibility of implementation.

According to the Municipality Public Relations Officer Mathokoza Thwala road rehabilitation is done through a priority list developed by Council experts and residents. He said residents submit their infrastructure needs when council develops the IDP.

through the input of stakeholders and residents of the city.

Thwala said residents and stakeholders are encouraged to participate in the upcoming IDP ward meetings to submit their infrastructure needs so that their needs are reflected in the long term plans of Council. The City PRO said council would continue to address road maintenance needs.

"Following the heavy rains a number of roads were severely affected- namely Meintjies Road leading out of the main bus rank and Stanley Road.

"In Ngwane Park. Council is pleased to report that Meintijes Road had been attended to. The potholes were filled Friday and work on Stanley has begun," Thwala stated.

He further added that residents should be aware that the process of filling potholes requires that first they be filled with gravel then 'ollowed by bitumen after the gravel is compacted.


Those behind the awards also appealed to the public to support this initiative and stated "your presence and participation is humbly requested as this event and it will go a long way in assisting the nominated pupils."

REFRESH WHAT YOU THINK...



ONE of the most popular questions whenever the conversation about the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill (SODV) comes up is, 'Why the focus on women?'

While the Bill seeks to protect both men and women, there has always been the need to protect women from violence because they are the primary victims of violence, with consequences as serious as death. The way in which the law protects men and women against violence cannot be the same because there is a difference between the experiences of violence between these two genders.

While any men may claim to have experienced violence from women, this does not bring context to the matter. It does not explain the motive or seriousness of the crime, regardless of whether a serious or a minor injury results. How the law protects men and women against violence considers the

comparable physical injury inflicted on men and women. This is why everyone needs to be actively involved in the advocacy for passing of the Bill because such factors (physical injury) completely disregard the other consequences and types of abuse such as psychological and financial abuse.

But still, why the focus on women? While men suffer domestic violence. it is women who suffer chronic abuse, post-separation abuse, and serious abuse such as strangulation, severe injury, sexual abuse and death. And most of these crimes are usually perpetuated by men on women.

Both men and women under-report abuse. Women opt not to report because 'tibitendlu', they are advised by family members not to report because the matter can be resolved at family level. Or they simply do not report because the perpetrator is a bread winner at home, if he is sent to jail no one will take care of the family. Other women do not report abuse because they feel that the man was justified in hitting her because she may have done something to provoke him, or she was raped because she 'asked for it' by wearing revealing clothing.

While on the other hand, a study by Davis (2016) revealed that men underreport simply because they are not bothered or not impressed.

Women have different motivations, such as self-defense. But whatever reason, it does not justify any form of violence inflicted against men. However,

it does explain why violence against women is the major focus in the Bill because it is used on women as coercive control. It is part of a pattern of behaviour which has been described as 'intimate terrorism' or 'passion killing', where violence is used as a strategy to control the victim through isolation, intimidation, humiliation and deprivation of money. women have died or suffered in the hands or men, no drastic measures have been taken. It is for that reason that the SODV Bill is expected to not bring miracles, but at least be the first step in the right direction.

Before we lose any more of our sisters, mothers and friends. Despite the reports that the police have been trained on GBV, many still show a general misunderstanding of the seriousness of domestic violence. Yet, when the law changes to accommodate gender based violence, the police are supposed to roll with it, primarily because they are the first ones to receive victims of gender based violence.

In summary, it is common understanding that the law should protect all victims of violence, but due to many factors and severity of consequences women need protection the most. When two soldiers come from war, one cannot walk because both his legs are severely injured, while the other one only has a scratch on one of his arms, the most natural thing to do is focus on the one soldier that needs the most attention while keeping in mind that they BOTH need help. But the focus will be mostly on the one that is in most danger. That is how it is with gender based violence and the protection of men and women.



RACISM TIME BOMB IS TICKII

Without a proper dialogue about our recent racist past, more radical actions can be expected to follow in future instances of racism by corporates and individuals.

A NEW ERA OF MODERN LEADERSHIP HAS DAWNED UNDER RAMAPHOSA

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's era of being ruled over by an African Strongman, like a traditional chief, is over and a new era of modern leadership has started.

It may sound obvious, but it's a big thing, a fundamental shift that I believe historians will one day write a special chapter on.

There was a telling incident, small but symbolically significant, on Saturday when the new ANC President, Cyril Ramaphosa, insisted that the ANC rally start exactly on time and strongly stressed that it was the way of the future. President Jacob Zuma arrived some forty minutes later with a phalanx of body-

Did we, with our history and demographics, perhaps have to go through a Zuma period before we could cross a kind of Rubicon and become the country we're ready to be?

Favours

It's going to be a big adjustment. For nearly a decade we were used to a singing, dancing head of state, a man with a huge family not averse to wearing the traditional dress of leopard skins; a patriarch who sat on a throne like a king, dishing out and receiving favours and gifts; a much feared figure who showed off his power like a bodybuilder flexing his muscles.

The contrast between Zuma and Ramaphosa are as stark as the contrast between Barack Obama and Donald Trump.

Zuma is a wily, ruthless street fighter wielding a machete, Ramaphosa a fine, calculated strategist who prefers a scalpel.

Ramamphosa is an educated, sophisticated urbanite and citizen of the world; a thinker, a constitutionalist, someone who really understands the economy and international affairs.

To him, cheap populism is as offensive as cheap whiskey.

Detached

What is more, Ramaphosa is democratic South Africa's first President not coming from the ranks of the ANC in exile or the Mandela-era Robben Islanders. His early political activism was interwined with the trade unions and the UDF with its pluralistic tradition. His student activist roots were in the Black People's Convention.

Thabo Mbeki was, of course, also an urban intellectual, but he was a detached figure in the shadow of Nelson Mandela and his legacy has been totally eclipsed by the Zuma

Ramaphosa is clearly very aware that many South Africans will be wary of his new style. That was why his first action as party leader was to visit traditional chiefs and

why he speaks almost all the indigenous languages at every possible occasion.

He needs to at the same reassure traditionally-minded citizens and seduce them into walking the modernising road with him. He is the party's only hope to win next year's general elections.

Ramaphosa didn't speak only as ANC President on Saturday, he spoke as the incoming president of the country.

He did not only spell out his vision for his party, but for the country: the economy, land reform, corruption and state capture, tertiary education, the problems with the criminal justice system and state-owned enterprises.

His theme was change and rejuvenation and virtually every second sentence was a damning judgment of the Zuma era, without being too obvious about it. (He used the word 'decorum' in every interview he gave since his election.)

Many South Africans feel Ramaphosa should have forced Zuma's resignation by now, but he clearly knows that a Zuma exit should be negotiated meticulously to minimise the fall-out. It's a delicate issue, he said in his Sunday interviews, stressing that Zuma's departure should not amount to a humiliation.

Remarks

Ramaphosa will represent his country at the weekend's World Economic Forum as its de facto leader.

It is hard to imagine that he will allow Zuma to present the State of the Nation Address in a month's

Ramaphosa's remarks on the need for new leadership at the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) are significant and an indication that he plans to force criminal investigations on Zuma and his state capture friends.

It is not a coincidence that after all these years, the Asset Forfeiture Unit has suddenly moved on the Guptas, the NPA has served a preservation order on Trillian and McKinsey and the Hawks have reportedly asked for an arrest warrant for one or more of the Gupta brothers.

Even Zuma's staunchest supporters now know that the pending commission of inquiry into state capture will be limited to the public protector's report and that the evidence against Zuma is likely to be overwhelming.

Having said all this, I would advise against over-optimism that Ramaphosa will 'fix' South Africa quickly.

The ANC is still a fractured movement and its culture of entitlement, corruption and nepotism that built up over years is still largely in place. News24

The ANC's January 8th Statement and its great expectations

It's a new dawn, it's a new day, it's a new lease on political life for South Africa's governing party.

This, at least, is what the newly elected leadership and several pundits want to believe, and want to persuade the rest of us to believe as well. Politics, after all, is like religion, not only in that both make for potentially awkward conversations when in confined spaces with strangers (think taxis, dinner parties, or workplace canteens). Both require proselytes to the party creed to convince others and bring them into the fold.

Much has been made of the shifts which could be observed at the ANC's 106th anniversary celebrations in East London's Buffalo City Stadium. Not only did proceedings begin on time - four minutes earlier than scheduled - but the entire programme ran mostly according to the timetable. The event was well-attended, the supporters w



vocal in their support for the new leadership, especially the party's new President, Cyril Ramaphosa. While starting on time and running to schedule should not be a cause for celebration, the party's record on this score over the last few years made this shift notable.

Many critics have long maintained that those who cannot run an event should not run a state. Hopefully, the changes indicated in the ambitious programme of renewal announced in this January 8th

Statement will be implemented. Of course, such announcements are the stuff of every recent January 8th Statement, but this time, the expectation is that it will be implemented. And that, indeed, is the test for the governing party. With just over a year before the next general election, the importance of the ANC's ability to make good on the promises cannot be understated.

Much of the work lies inside the party, cleaning up its structures and processes. The dysfunction in the

branches and in the provincial structures led to several public and at times humiliating court battles, some of which have yet to be concluded. This may be tested earlier rather than later, with questions about the functioning of the party's disciplinary processes. Can they function effectively, without fear of interference, and will members and officials abide by the findings and recommendations? The historical record on this matter does not necessarily inspire confidence.

In response to the 'two centres of power anxiety', Jeff Radebe was unequivocal: Luthuli House, named for one of the party's two Nobel Peace Prize Laureates, would be the strategic centre of power. Ramaphosa went further, indicating that any deployed cadre, no matter how senior, who sowed division, would be instantly called to account for their conduct. eNCA

Trump's shitholes and the semantics of politics

President Donald Trump is at it again, this time causing a global storm by referring to Haiti and African countries as "shithole countries" that do not produce desirable immigrants for the United States (US).

America's self-proclaimed "stable genius" has broken the diplomatic etiquette by calling it as it is. Poor African countries are usually politely referred to as "developing nations".

Some of those countries have eventually made it from being classified as developing nations to a more prestigious class of the "emerging markets". This is because of their fairly decent mixed economies and a just-better-than-worst measure of economic growth.

If a country handles its economy fairly well by putting in place a few austerity measures to show that the leaders understand that inflation is not a soccer team then that country gets bumped up to the emerging market category.

Those countries are often, however, functionally corrupt and have a social backlog that causes occasional social unrest and so forth.

Trump is not known for his politeness. He is rude and at times naively honest, as he has shown with his recent remark.

Some years back before he could even dream of running the US, African countries and some of their South American counterparts were

referred to as "third world countries", while advanced countries such and the US and other western European nations were referred to as "first world countries", or normal countries for that matter.

The term "third world" smacked of a superiority complex and imperialism. The use of the phrase was discontinued because it became generally accepted among development scholars that colonialism and slavery enriched western countries at the expense of those countries on Trump's shithole list.

Academics became more and more polite and desisted from using historically unpalatable classifications such as "third world".

A great deal of improvement has happened at semantic level with a shift from using disparaging terms to refer to post-colonial nations, while the actual problem of their poor state of development largely remains the same.

By referring to those countries in the manner he did, Trump only blathered out what most people see but find rude to say.

Even among African nations there are those who consider others to be more inferior. Remember what President Jacob Zuma said about Malawi back in 2013? Responding to people's refusal to pay for the use of Gauteng Highways, Zuma said: "We can't think like Africans

in Africa, generally. We are in Johannesburg. This is Johannesburg. It is not some national road in Malawi." Zuma was actually saying that South Africa is not a shithole country like Malawi.

The problem with being polite is that you have to work hard at your use of language because the whole idea is to find a way to avoid the elephant in the room. Inventing meaningless phrases to refer to poverty and hopelessness is a disservice to those who live under poverty and sheer destitution.

African countries really get worked up when referred to in a negative manner, even if the classifications are not always far from the truth. In my favourite politics satire TV show Yes Minister, the minister (Sir Humphrey) is warned not to refer to an African country as a "Tin Pot Little African Country" (TPLAC) because the country has oil and its leaders will be upset by the use of such a term. The minister is rather urged to use the polite term "Less Developed country" (LCD).

In all this, I don't think we should have sleepless nights because of Trump's statement. He is a moron, as his secretary of state Rex Tillerson has rightfully concluded. This time his stupidity has offended African countries. The African Union (AU) is demanding an apology.

I wonder when last did an African leader meaningfully apologise to the people after wrongdoing.

Churches appeal court ruling on spanking of children


SOME churches and Christian lobbies are outraged by a groundbreaking South African court ruling on October 19 last year that outlaws the spanking of children. The court found that the common law defence of spanking as a "reasonable and moderate chastisement" of a child in the home is unconstitutional.

Violence against children is a major problem in the country. A disturbing 2016 study with more than 9 500 adolescents suggested that one in three children under 18 has been hit, beaten or kicked by an adult care giver. Earlier studies show that more than half of South African parents have admitted they hit their children; 38 per cent termed this a "severe beating"

There's been a flurry of negative responses to the court ruling by some vocal faith groups.

They promote a conservative and contested understanding of religious freedom in post-apartheid South Africa that reinforces biblical literalism, hierarchical family structures and the right of parents to discipline children in a so-called "godly way".

This approach is epitomised by the organisation Freedom of Religion South Africa (FOR SA). It claims to represent 12 million South Africans



in 2017. and has launched an appeal against the court judgement.

Other local Christian organisations such as The Warehouse have offered a more constructive response. This recognises a need to rethink tradition and scriptures in the light of new knowledge. This approach aims to better equip churches to play a leading role in reshaping social norms to embrace progressive changes; in this instance when it comes to the treatment of children. This is more in line with the many global faith organisations that are working to end violence against children. Their views were reflected in commitments made in Panama

These approaches represent two poles in a wider theological debate around the possible relationships between religion and human rights. One uses sacred texts in a literal way to legitimise certain forms of hierarchical violence as God ordained. The other seeks to transform these texts by adopting a contextual approach to the same tradi-

When faith does violence

South Africa has a long history of using Christian sacred texts to underpin ideologies of superiority and domination.

This includes justifying slavery.

colonialism, apartheid, homophobia and patriarchy. In 1985 a group of predominately black theologians used a grassroots process to produce a contentious document that challenged the churches to reject this state theology as well as silent complicity by churches.

The same pattern can be seen today on the issue of spanking and children's rights. Biblical literalism is being used to support corporal punishment, framed as both loving parenthood and obedience to God's commands

Specific texts such as Proverbs 13:24 promote complex reinforcements between religion and culture underpinned by a view of the child as bad, disobedient and in need of physical correction. According to this passage:

He who withholds his rod hates his son, but he who loves him disciplines him diligently.

Children are often presented as being at the bottom of a hierarchy of human importance, where a father historically held the power of life and death over "his" household as God's representative. In this authoritarian system, men wield power over women, adults over children, rich over poor, straight over gay and white over black. AFP

2017 A GREAT YEAR FOR MAIZE PRODUCERS

THE previous year's good rainy season has gone a long way in bringing a good harvest for local maize producers.

This is according to a report from The National Maize Corporation (NMC)

"The 2017 harvest proved 2017 was a great year for maize producers in the country as compared to the past 10 years of production.

"With the previous season being the worst experienced in decades, it was forecasted that good rains would be experienced and production was also projected at 84 344 metric tonnes," the report said.

The rainy season's results have been echoed by South African online publication News24.

"The outlook on food inflation will not change significantly in the near to medium term, because of the buffer of large stocks from the previous agricultural season.

"Overall, a clearer picture of SA's 2017/18 grain and oilseed production will unravel later this month when the National Crop Estimate Committee releases its preliminary planting data estimates," the report said.

South African economist Wandile Sihlobo, at the Agricultural Business

Chamber (AGBIZ) added and said,
"The eastern parts of SA gen-

"The eastern parts of SA - generally Mpumalanga, KwaZulu Natal, the eastern Free State and the northern parts of the Eastern Cape - received good rainfall during the festive season. Crops are generally in a fair condition. But in some areas crops were affected by hail," he said.

NMC reported that by the end of November 2017 the corporation had brought 8945 metric tonnes from local farmers.

"This is the highest local purchase

in a decade for the corporation followed by 6364 metric tonnes recorded during the 2011/12 farming season.

"It is also an increase of over 400 per cent compared to last season's 1586 metric tonnes which also reflected the lowest purchase thus far," the report said.

In addition Sihlobo further reported that the central and western parts of the country received very little rainfall in the last few weeks of 2017 and also experienced a drier start to 2018.

Delays

This led to delays in summer crop planting activity, particularly in the North West, and the western parts of the Free State. These provinces collectively account for 68 per cent of the intended maize planting area of 2.47 million hectares in the 2017/18 season.

They also account for 86 per cent of the 665 500 hectares intended for sunflower seed production in the 2017/18 season, Sihlobo pointed out in the AGBIZ newsletter.

The good rains have also helped in ensuring food security in the country as NMC has capacity building programs to sustain the increase in the production and supply of maize.

"Generally Shiselweni, Manzini and Hhohho regions recorded the highest tonnages, which is an indication that these are high maize producing areas," the report said.

It was further noted that farmers were encouraged to grow and supply maize to NMC as there were predictions of good rains.

"NMC together with the ministry of agriculture played a significant role in motivating farmers to grow and supply maize to NMC.

"This was through programs such as farmer contracting, farmer development (extension services) and farmer awareness.

"The corporation also made efforts in collecting maize from farmers situated in some parts of the country distant from the silo sites," the report said.

According to the Central Statistical Office Statistical News for December 2017, "Food and non-alcoholic beverages inflation decreased from 3.5 per cent in November 2017 to 2.6 per cent in December 2017.

"Food such as vegetables, bread and cereals and non-alcoholic beverages coffee, tea and cocoa were the largest contributors to the lower index," the report said.

BITCOIN COULD BE TAXED IN SOUTH AFRICA

POPULAR cryptocurrency trend 'Bitcoin' is soon reported to be taxed in South Africa despite being an illegal platform to trade; this is according to South African online publication eNCA.

"The South African Revenue Service (SARS) will soon provide clarity on the tax implications of transacting in crypto currency like Bitcoin.

The tax regulatory, however, said while traders wait on guidelines, those who need to declare should do so now," the

This comes after the cryptocurrency has gained momentum globally despite its dangers that have been raised.

This was at a conference was hosted by the Swaziland Economic Policy Analysis and Research Centre (SEPA-RC) in collaboration with the University of Swaziland, the Swaziland Economic Conference held at the Royal Swazi Convention Centre in October last year and the Central Bank of Swaziland.

"The Central Bank governor warned in the conference that because Bitcoins are not a legal tender in Swaziland, they are not regulated and as such, people who lose out or do not get the desired returns do not have any protection from government.

"The governor, nevertheless, did not shy away from the Bitcoins debate as he pointed the need for central banks to conduct research on cryptocurrencies. Sithole said wishing cryptocurrencies away would not be a wise thing to do because indicators show that they are here to stay.

Economist Sanele Sibiya also warned potential investors to exercise caution when investing in Bitcoin this year.

He said it is highly possibly that the virtual currency may not bring the same returns this year as it did in 2017.

"People should not expect the same rapid growth that Bitcoin had last year in 2018," he said, warning potential investors to refrain from the blind belief that they will get high returns this year. Because of the astoundingly high value, many people the world over invest in



Bitcoins with the hope of making quick

The use of Bit coin has been rapidly growing in South Africa and it is so popular that people can pay with the crypto currency at certain spots. SARS is treating cryptocurrencies under Capital Gains Tax, but it is an area it said it plans to explore further.

"Because by the very nature it lends itself to money laundering and anonymised trading, so yes we have to put in and place additional regulations. And to that end, we are going to release an interpretation note from our legal department to guide taxpayers as to their implications with respect to this Bitcoin technology," said the head of SARS' tax research, Randall Carolissen.

The revenue service said it is consulting with top technology companies in the world that are doing similar work.

SARS said it is very difficult to monitor block chain technology and depending on what Bitcoin is used, it will determine how tax deductions are deter-

"Since it's not legal tender it is treat-

ed as an asset in your hands. And depending on your intent with this asset, it can trigger different tax instruments. It can either be a revenue nature or it could be an asset, capital gains tax in nature,' Carolissen said.

Even though taxpayers are still waiting for the interpretation and guidelines of cryptocurrencies, SARS has urged all traders or buyers to declare where

"People need to come forward and regualise their tax affairs with us. And the guideline will also assist them with that. But as and when you submit your tax returns you must declare that as either additional income or additional asset revenue realisation that you've

"So it's very important that you don't discard or ignore that part. Especially those people who took advantage of Bitcoin currency in the early stages."

SARS is also liaising with the South African Reserve Bank to see how they can better match cross-border outflows and inflows of money so that people will have less room to hide things.

SOUTH KOREAN GOVERNMENT

SOUTH Korea's justice minister said on cryptocurrency trading was announced last Thursday the government is after "enough discussion" with other preparing a Bill to ban cryptocurrency trading, throwing the virtual- nation's finance ministry and financial coin market into turmoil as the nation's police and tax authorities raided local exchanges on alleged tax evasion.

The clampdown in South Korea, a crucial source of global demand for cryptocurrency, came as policy makers around the world struggled to regulate an asset whose value has skyrocketed over the last year.

"There are great concerns regarding virtual currencies and the justice ministry is basically preparing a Bill to ban cryptocurrency trading through exchanges," said Park Sang-ki at a press conference, according to the ministry's press office. A press official said the proposed ban government agencies including the regulators.

The nation's largest cryptocurrency exchanges like Coinone and Bithumb were raided by police and tax agencies this week for alleged tax evasion.

The raids follow moves by the finance ministry to identify ways to tax the market that has become as big as the nation's small-cap Kosdaq index in terms of daily trading volume.

Park Nok-sun, a cryptocurrency analyst at NH Investment & Securities, said the herd behaviour in South Korea's virtual coin market has stoked concerns.

Indeed, Bitcoin's 1 500 per cent surge last year has stoked huge demand for cryptocurency in South Korea, drawing college students to housewives and sparking worries of a gambling addic-

"Virtual coins trade at a hefty premium in South Korea, and that is herd behaviour showing how strong demand is here," Park said.

"Some officials are pushing for stronger and stronger regulations because they only see more (investors) jumping in, not out."

Bitcoin sank on Monday after website CoinMarketCap removed prices from South Korean exchanges, because coins were trading at a premium of about 30 per cent in Asia's fourth-largest economy.

That created confusion and triggered a broad selloff among investors.

Banks, retailers push JSE higher on buoyant global backdrop

JOHANNESBURG - The JSE gained yesterday as locally focused company shares rose against the backdrop of continued positive sentiment in global equity mar-

The rand boosted banks, financials, property and general retailers after hitting a two-and-a-halfyear high against the Dollar, ahead of the Reserve Bank meeting on interest rates later in the week.

A firmer currency holds the promise of an interest-rate cut, which will support consumer spending and so benefit these sectors.

Miners were down on the firmer rand, with expectations of further gains by the local currency. Data released on the day indicated that production in the mining sector accelerated to 6.5 per cent in November from 5.2 per cent in October, with platinum group metals the biggest driver.

Retailers were supported by Shoprite, which rebounded after initially falling, on a subdued operating update. Shoprite said it increased turnover 6.3 per cent for the six months to December 2017, in contrast with the flat results from Woolworths on Monday, with the latter also having a weaker outlook.

The listed property sector continued its recovery, jumping more than two per cent after retreating last week. Shares in the Resilient stable were top performers, after plummeting last week on rumours that it would be the next local company named by the shadowy Viceroy Research Group.

Naspers bucked the trend among the Rand hedges, with the sector generally weaker on the firmer Rand.

The Dow opened 0.84 per cent higher, hitting 26 000 points for the first time, only two weeks after crossing 25 000. European markets were mixed with the FTSE 100 down 0.12 per cent, while the DAX 30 was up 0.92 per cent.

Some analysts are worried about the high valuations of global markets. "It's been a relatively quiet start to the new year, yet markets have continued to push on higher, with investors clearly optimistic ahead of the fourth-quarter earnings season," Oanda analyst Craig Erlam said.

The all share closed 0.68 per cent higher at 60 649.60 points and the blue-chip top 40 rose 0.65 per cent. Banks added 3.02 per cent, property 2.42 per cent, general retailers 2.26 per cent, financials 2.05 per cent and industrials 1.29 per cent. The gold index shed 3.75 per cent, resources 2.3 per cent and platinums 2.09 per cent.

Anglo American lost 2.97 per cent to R292.94. BUSINESSDAY

'SA ready to fund free university education'

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa is pushing ahead with a plan to offer free university education to students from poor households and will announce funding details in next month's budget, Finance Minister Malusi Gigaba said yesterday.

President Jacob Zuma said last month the government would bankroll the tuition without giving details of how it would be funded. The announcement rattled financial markets and critics said it was a populist promise that risked widening an already gaping budget deficit.


A government report and the treasury said the plan is unaffordable. Some critics also said the timing of the announcement, which came days before Zuma stepped down as leader of the ruling African National Congress, showed he no longer cared about fiscal respon-

Gigaba told reporters at a televised briefing in the capital Pretoria that costs estimates had been finalised and the plan would be implemented over eight years.

"The president found himself in an invidious position... It is about how to manage the process and implement it in a sustainable manner without having to breach the fiscal expenditure ceiling," he said.

"If the president had not acted this year to provide some funding it would have resulted in further protests," he said.

Since 2015 protests by students demanding free education rocked campuses across the country, disrupting teaching and examinations and culminating in a march to Zuma's offices in Pretoria that saw the president freeze tuition increas-

ZIM TOURISM INDUSTRY HAS GROWN SINCE MUGABE'S EXIT

HARARE - Zimbabwe's tourism industry has started to pick up, with arrivals seen growing this year following the exit of former leader Robert Mugabe in November last year, while online booking platform, Airbnb, says visitors booking for accommodation through the application are mostly originating from Johannesburg and London.

The country has dangled a \$15 million (R185.22m) incentive facility for the tourism industry, Central Bank Governor John Mangudya said last Friday.

The Hotels Association of Zimbabwe said hotel occupancy levels during the December festive season increased from 85per cent in 2016 to about 92per cent in 2017. Traveller risk perceptions of Zimbabwe have worsened over the past few years, owing to poor road infrastructure, police roadblocks and political uncertainty that frequently turned interest But following the installation of a new administration in Harare, travel experts and government officials said

the situation was now improving.

Zimbabwe's new administration has extended open arms to travellers to the country in a bid to grow the tourism

industry's contribution to the country's economic recovery.

"There has been keen interest in Zimbabwe, particularly after the events that took place in November 2017. We have seen growing demand for destinations, mainly in Hwange and, of course, Victoria Falls," Mlandeli Ndlela, a safari operator with Sikiliza DMC, told Business Report. Other operators and tour experts say Zimbabwe's Eastern Highlands have

witnessed resurgent tourist arrivals in December and so far in January. Travel across Zimbabwe has become easier, with police roadblocks being whittled down and spot fines being stopped.

Woolworths faces the eye of the storm

JOHANNESBURG - Latest trading update confirms worrying outlook for Woolworths in SA and Australia.

Ian Moir, the straight-talking Scotsman at the helm of Woolworths, was unusually bearish about the retailer's outlook at its annual results presentation in August last year.

Woolworths earned the title of 'SA's retail darling' for staying resilient during uncertain times, is in the eye of a storm. "It's going to be tough. We are under no illusions about that... margins [a key metric for measuring profitability in the retail industry] will tread down over the medium term," Moir told analysts.

But investors didn't expect the extent of Woolworths' woes, which first came to a head in a grim sales update two years ago. Woolworths is facing many battles: declining clothing sales as a result of aggressive promotions by competitors, SA's moribund economy and the burning of cash in turning around the fortunes of its Australian business, David Jones. Woolworths completed its ambitious R22 billion acquisition of David Jones and sister retailer Country Road Group in 2014 - tipped to turn it into a substantial retailer in the southern hemisphere. Some investors were nervous at the sheer scale of the acquisition while others cheered the bold move down underover concerns that Woolworths had limited growth opportunities in Africa.

But the excitement around David Jones and Country Road fizzled out in 2016 when sales growth began to lag those of average department store sales in Australia – 12 per cent versus 5.3 per cent It became clear that management could not deliver on their overzealous expectations from the Australian operations.

In two years, its share price has sunk by 43 per cent from highs of R105.66 in November 2015 to R59.85 at the time of writing. Woolworths, a JSE top 40 stock, featured in the list of top ten worst performers in 2016.

The latest sales update underscores how 2018 will be another extremely tough year for Woolworths. On Monday, it said group sales increased by 2.5 per cent in the 26 weeks to December 24, 2017, which failed to keep in line with SA's inflation rate of between 4 per cent and 5 per cent over the same period.

One of its biggest problems is the South African fashion, beauty and home division, which saw sales decline by 0.2 per cent while comparable store sales (excluding new stores opened) fell by 3.4 per cent Alec Abraham, a senior analyst at Sasfin Securities, said a division's performance was worse than expected.

"I get the sense that most fashion retailers have been hit more by structural changes such as competition and promotional activity changes than cyclical changes like economic growth and low consumer confidence. Woolworths will have to be on top of its game as there is more competition," said Abraham.

The price of sending a parcel overseas via Post Office

CAPE TOWN - The Independent Communications Authority of South Africa (ICASA), a regulator for the South African communications sector, has revealed the new postage fees for 2018.

These fees will apply from April 1, 2018.

1. Domestic parcels

Any domestic postal item larger than 250 x 353 mm and/or thicker than 30mm and/or weighing more than 1kg is considered to be a parcel, the Post Office said.

Domestic parcel services such as counter-tocounter deliveries are charged as follows:

R52.50 for the first kilogram.
R7.05 for each additional kilogram or part of a kilogram.

2. International parcels

Parcel services are available worldwide, either by airmail or surface mail.

"These services may be accessed by posting either at post offices or by posting in street posting boxes," said the Post Office.

"Exchange control regulations apply equally to postal items as they do to other exports," the company added.

3. Small parcel pricing

A small parcel may not exceed 900mm when its length, width, and depth are combined.

The greatest dimension may also not exceed 600mm, while the maximum weight of the parcel can be 2kg.

ESKOM aims to challenge NERSA's 5.23% tariff increase

CAPE TOWN - ESKOM said it will take action, only after the National Energy Regulator of South Africa has justified the reasons for the 5.23 per cent tariff increase.

ESKOM's Deputy Spokesperson, Dikatso Mothae told Fin24 that they are awaiting for the regulator's reasons for the decision to determine what impact it will have on the business and then decide on the way forward.

It is believed that ESKOM was considering a court review of the NERSA's decision.

NERSA caught ESKOM by surprise when it rejected the 19.9 per cent proposed tariff increase.

The energy regulator substantiated that it followed due regulatory processes in considering ESKOM's revenue application for 2018/19 before it took its decision.

ESKOM's release of interim financial results had to be postponed in December 2017, as it claimed it had to review the impact of the 5.23 per cent price increase as well as to allow the newly-appointed board members sufficient time to review the financials.

"ESKOM is assessing the impact

of the lower than anticipated tariff increase for the 2018/19 financial year approved by the National Energy Regulator of South Africa (NERSA) last week Friday. NERSA approved an allowable revenue of R190 billion, resulting in an average percentage price increase of 5.23 per cent against ESKOM's request for an average standard price increase of 19.9 per cent," ESKOM announcement read.

ESKOM said it is within rights to challenge NERSA's decision, considering the National Energy Regulator Act.

In June 2017, ESKOM said the major reason for the need for a whopping 19.9 per cent tariff increase, is to make up for its own sales projections made earlier, which were not realised.

The Organisation Undoing Tax Abuse, however, slammed this reasoning, saying ESKOM's own false projections did not give them the licence to punish the consumer.

It is understood that if the 19.9 per cent tariff increase is approved, municipalities could then in turn increase electricity to consumers by up to 27 per cent *Business Report Online*

Bitcoin slides 14% on crackdown fears, hits 4-week low

LONDON - Bitcoin slid as much as 14 per cent yesterday to hit a four-week low below \$12 000, as fears grew of a regulatory crackdown after reports that South Korea's finance minister had said banning trading in cryptocurrencies was still an option.

South Korean news website Yonhap reported that Finance Minister Kim Dong-yeon had told a local radio station that the government would be coming up with a set of measures to clamp down on the 'irrational'

cryptocurrency investment craze.

Bitcoin slid on the news, trading as low as \$11 730 on the Luxembourgbased Bitstamp exchange, down 13.6 per cent on the day.

The latest tumble leaves Bitcoin more than 40 per cent down from the record highs of around \$20 000 reached in mid-December, wiping about \$125 billion from its 'market cap' - the price of Bitcoin multiplied by the total number of Bitcoins that have been 'mined', or released into the market-Reuters



RAND BRIEFLY TOUCHES THREE-YEAR HIGH AS DOLLAR ON BACK FOOT

CAPE TOWN - The Rand broke below the R12.30/\$ level yesterday morning, and even tested R12.20 to the US currency.

By late morning it was at R12.24/\$. The last time the local unit was at the R12.20 level was around June 2015.

According to TreasuryONE dealer Andre Botha, there is no clear reason as yet for the currency's sudden surge, except the impact of the weaker dollar.

"No official headline for the current surge is forthcoming, but we are enjoying the fruits of a weaker dollar and possibly the after effects of the National Prosecuting Authority looking at the Guptas," Botha commented yesterday morning.

By late morning the Rand was trading at R12.23. Botha added that much of Monday's "lack-lustre performance" of the market can be attributed to a public holiday (Martin Luther King Day) in the US. "We saw the Rand floating in a 10 cent range for most of the day (Monday), still looking for direction," said Botha.

"Even though the US was out of the market, it didn't stop the dollar from sliding further against the Euro. The US Dollar reached 1.2296 yesterday on the speculation that the European Central Bank might halt the quantitative easing programme abruptly instead of gradually taper-



ing the programme." In his view, the weaker Dollar theme seems to be firmly entrenched for the first part of 2018. "On the local side, we still await any real news regarding domestic politics which is a constraint on the rand rallying stronger. The Rand is stuck between no-man's land with global factors such as the weaker Dollar and

global yield-seeking behaviour favouring the Rand," said Botha.

"However, the threat of local politics upsetting the applecart is also real. This has led the Rand to trade in limbo as it is awaiting direction from either one of the two camps."

Momentum economist Sanisha Packirisamy also agrees it is likely mainly Dollar weakness - the greenback is touching a three-year low - reflected in the Rand's performance at the moment.

"Potentially, there may have been some additional uplift on recent political developments speculation that President Jacob Zuma may not serve out his full term in the Presidency and an indication that law agencies are acting on state capture allegations," she told Fin24.

Bianca Botes of corporate treasury management at Peregrine Treasury Solutions said the Rand breaking through the key support level of R12.25 briefly, touching on R12.20, was mostly driven by "political noise" coupled with the weaker Dollar and strong commodity prices.

"The key, however, still remains in getting this to translate into gross domestic product (GDP) growth, stimulating the economy," said Botes.

In her view, some recovered confidence in the ANC is definitely helping the Rand, giving it a boost. She expected the Rand to remain within the R12.20 to R12.35 range yesterday. *Fin24*



Shoprite blames deflation for disappointing growth

JOHANNESBURG-Shoprite [JSE:SHP] announced subdued growth yesterday, blaming deflation for its lacklustre performance.

The group increased its turnover by 6.3 per cent for the six months to December 2017 - less than half of the 14 per cent achieved in the same period in 2016.

CEO Pieter Engelbrecht said overall internal price deflation occurred in the last quarter, and that the slowdown in turnover growth should be viewed in the context of average grocery price inflation decelerating to 0.4 per cent during the reporting period. It was 7.4 per cent in the corresponding period.

Supermarkets RSA, Shoprite's primary business, increased sales by 7.8 per cent during a period when internal inflation fell to 0.4 per cent for the six months compared to 7.4 per cent in the previous corresponding period, driven mainly by a drop in the price of basic commodity items.

Shoprite said economic and trading conditions in its foreign markets remained unchanged, and as a result the group's non-South African supermarket operating segment reported a 0.4 per cent drop in rand terms. The impact of lower commodity prices and the depreciation of local currencies remained prevalent in the larger economies it operates in outside South Africa, the group stated. Shoprite's furniture division reported increased sales of 10.8 per cent while other operating segments, mainly driven by the OK Franchise division's performance, saw 6.7 per cent growth. Engelbrecht said this was pleasing given low internal price inflation, and was in line with the group's South African supermarket performance. Shoprite's interim results are scheduled for release on February 27.

Shares in Shoprite were trading at R214.54, up 0.72 per cent on the JSE shortly before 14:00. *Fin24*

Smooth-sailing for university walk-in's - Chairperson

CAPE TOWN - The Chairperson of the Portfolio Committee on Higher Education and Training, Connie September commends higher institutions extra efforts in accommodating the Department of Higher Education and Training's registration challenges.

This comes after universities have announced that they are allowing prospective students a second window to apply for admission at tertiary institutions.

Some of the universities who will be allowing walk-in applications include Sol Plaatje University in the Northern Cape and the University of South Africa (UNISA).

"Whilst taking issue with the short period within which they had to respond to the new policy, the institutions nevertheless welcomed the decision of free education for the poor. It is worth noting that these institutions are now working with each other in a coherent way due to the new policy", said September.

"We must also welcome the efforts made by the institutions to take the opportunity to make improvements in the manner applications are processed, as well as the installation of more technologies and volunteers to assist the process", added September.

As part of her constituency work, September had undertaken visits to various institutions where she says she observed a "steady but organised registration of students including first time applicants, who decided to do walkin applications".

September's visits to various Higher Learning institutions is set to continue throughout the registration period.

The chairperson says that she was informed that the Minister of Higher and Education and Training, Hlengiwe Mkhize, had sent letters to various insttutions, informing them of their grants in December 2017.

SA Federation of Trade Unions backs workers strike at Dis-Chem Pharmacies

The Steenhuisen panel believes that instead of trying to get to the bottom of tensions, De Lille planned to punish DA members who made submissions against her to the commission.

Tensions between Smith, the mayoral committee member for safety, security and social services, and De Lille boiled over in August 2017 when she controversially ordered the shutting down of the SIU, which he headed.

'CT residents are victims of a political turf war'

> The report has found that: "The SIU and the citizens of Cape Town, have clearly become the victims of a 'turf war' between the mayor, speaker (Dirk Smit) and (JP Smith)."

In August 2017 the DA's federal executive mandated Steenhuisen to head up a subcommittee to look into tensions and political management in the City of Cape Town. Councillors were invited to make submissions on the matter in both writing and in person.

It is this report on this subcommittee's work, which the City has not released to the public, which details several shocking findings about De Lille's conduct and deep-rooted problems threatening to cripple the DA's Cape Town caucus - described in the document as the party's "flagship municipal government".

H&M has shown racial insensitivity before

CAPE TOWN - While H&M deals with a furore which has erupted following what has been labelled a racist advert, the Ahmed Kathrada Foundation on Monday said it was not the first time that H&M had come under scrutiny regarding racial insensitivity.

"In 2015, the company came under criticism from a social media user for not featuring black models following the opening of their stores in South Africa. The company's response via Twitter implied that white models were featured to create a 'positive image'," the foundation's Executive Director Neeshan Balton said in a statement.

"These two incidents are perhaps indicative of the type of ignorance that continues to prevail around issues related to race, perhaps not only at H&M, but in the broader advertising sector and in society in general."

The retailer recently caused outrage after it showed a black child in a sweatshirt with the words 'Coolest monkey in the jungle' printed on it.

H&M has since apologised and removed the image as well as the sweater from retail, saying it was "investigating internally to ensure this can't ever happen again."

The foundation said it had requested a meeting with H&M about how "such a racist advert could have passed by the company's marketing team, and its management, without the racial undertones being picked up."

In the letter, which was sent to its global headquarters as well as its South African office, the foundation said it questioned how the advert had been published "without considering the historical context of how the word and image of a monkey has been used to racially demean black people for generations."

The company had agreed to a meeting with its country manager, the foundation said.

"The foundation would use the opportunity to urge H&M to see the incident as a platform to effect change within the company. We want to get an understanding from the South African offices of how they have understood the incident and to get an overview of how they intend to remedy the situation,' Balton said. News 24



The world's coldest village..temperature reaches minus 62C

SIBERIA - Welcome to the coldest village on earth where the average temperature in January is -50C and inhabitant's eye lashes freeze solid mere moments after stepping outside.

The remote Siberian village of Oymyakon is the coldest permanently inhabited settlement in the world.

It was so icy in the Russian village that a new electronic thermometer conked out after recording a bonecracking minus 62C.

The official weather station at the 'pole of cold' registered minus 59C, but locals said their readings were as low as minus 67C - less than 1C off the lowest accepted temperature for a permanent settlement anywhere in the

And that record breaking recording was taken in the town back in 1933. One villager in Oymyakon recorded a temperature of minus 67C, while others agreed that the official reading of minus 59C did not tell the full story.

The digital thermometer was installed last year to help Oymyakon market itself to tourists, but it gave up the ghost at minus 62C.

"It broke because it was too cold,"reported The Siberian Times.
The town's name translates as 'the

water that doesn't freeze' and comes from the fact it sits above a thermal spring The village is home to around 500 hardy people and in the 1920s and 1930s was a stopover for reindeer herders who would water their flocks from the thermal spring. This is how the town got its name which translates as 'the water that doesn't freeze'. The Soviet government later made the site a permanent settlement during a drive to force its nomadic population into

putting down roots.

In 1933, a temperature of minus 67.7C was recorded in Oymyakon, accepted as the lowest ever in the northern hemisphere. Lower temperatures are recorded in Antarctica, but here there are no permanently inhabited settlements. Daily problems that come with living in Oymyakon include pen ink freezing, glasses freezing to people's faces and batteries losing power. Locals are said to leave their cars

running all day for fear of not being able to restart them. Rock solid earth makes burying the dead a difficult task. The earth must first have thawed sufficiently in order to dig, so a bonfire is lit for a few hours.

Hot coals are then pushed to the side and a hole just a few inches deep is dug. The process is repeated for several days until the hole is deep enough to bury the coffin.

After the discussions between the defence ministers of the so - called G5 Sahel and their French counterpart no details were released about the new operation due to "security reasons". "We are moving forward... the joint force is gaining momentum... the first operation has taken place, the second one is starting today," Malian Defence Minister Tiena Coulibaly told a press conference, alongside his G5 counterparts and French Defence Minister Florence Parly.AFP

Anti-cholera ban anger

LUSAKA - Police in Zambia's capital Lusaka on Monday fired tear gas at angry traders marching to the president's office in protest over a ban on street commerce aimed at curbing a deadly cholera outbreak. The 500-strong crowd was trying to deliver a petition to President Edgar Lungu who has become the public face of the campaign against the outbreak that has claimed at least 70 lives since September. Activist dies in prison

MALABO - An opposition activist died in prison after being tortured in Equatorial Guinea, the country's main opposition party said Monday, accusing the government of "cruel and inhumane" treatment of its detainees. Santiago Ebee Ela, 41, died at the central Police Station in capital Malabo on Saturday night as a result of "cruel torture", Citizens for Innovation (CI) said in a statement. "The death of Santiago Ebee Ela is a consequence of the cruel and inhumane treatment shown to CI detainees by security forces of the PDGE regime," it said, referring to the ruling Democratic Party of Equatorial Guinea headed by President Teodoro Obiang. Boko Haram 'Chibok girls' video a propaganda counter - strike

LONDON - The release of a video purporting to show some of the Nigerian Chibok schoolgirls kidnapped by Boko Haram apparently happy with their lives is a propaganda strike to show the Islamist group is unbowed, security experts said on Monday.

The video shows a group of about 12 teenage girls and young women, some of them holding babies.

"We are the Chibok girls. We are the ones you are crying about for us to come back. By the grace of Allah, we are never coming back," said one of the girls in the Hausa language widely spoken in northern Nigeria. Of some 220 girls abducted from their school in Chibok, northern Nigeria in April 2014, more than 100 have since been released

Grace supported her ageing husband's decision to resign'

Harare – Former Zimbabwean first lady Grace Mugabe supported her ageing husband's "decision to resign", Robert Mugabe's former spokesperson George Charamba has reportedly revealed.

Reports indicated that Grace had previously held her own presidential ambitions, as she reportedly led a campaign to get the then Vice President Emmerson Mnangagwa out. She was a key figure of the G40 faction that, until November 15, had the upper hand within the ruling ZANU-PF party.

Grace reportedly looked certain to become one of the country's two vice presidents following the sacking on November 6 of then Vice President Mnangagwa, who led a rival faction.

But, according to Charamba, Grace was behind her husband's decision to resign after the military took over control in November, reported Daily News on Sunday.

"Even the first lady (Grace Mugabe) was behind Mugabe's decision to resign," Charamba was quoted as saying.

Charamba said that Mugabe himself had wanted to leave office in his own terms but "they were a number of scenarios at play including marchers coming to force the veteran leader out of power", said Charamba. He said that the last days of Mugabe's presidency were very painful as loyalties to the nonagenarian had shifted.

Charamba said he had to remind the 93-year-old that there were "other dimensions" threatening his hold on power, including the peaceful protests that saw tens of thousands of Zimbabweans pour out onto the streets of Harare in support of the army. News24

Mugabe 'desperately tried to reappoint his ex-deputy

HARARE - An aide to former Zimbabwean president Robert Mugabe has revealed how generals warned him to step aside as protests against him grew, or face being "lynched" like Libya's Muammar Gaddafi.

Massive street protests against 93-year-old Mugabe erupted after the military briefly took power in November following the veteran leader's sacking of then-Vice President, Emmerson Mnangagwa.

Mugabe subsequently resigned after apparently striking a deal with the army and supporters of Mnangagwa who then succeeded Mugabe.

"The commanders sent us with a very chilling message, they said 'please go and get the president to appreciate the gravity of the situation out there'," Mugabe's former spokesperson, George Charamba, told the Daily News Sunday paper.

"There was the possibility of a Libyan scenario where the president would have been dragged out of the Blue roof and lynched," he added, referring to Mugabe's private residence in Harare.

Gaddafi was overthrown in 2011 after a violent popular uprising and slaughtered by a mob after he was found hiding in a drainage pipe. Charamba, who now serves as Mnangagwa's official spokesperson, revealed that Mugabe desperately tried to reappoint his former deputy at the height of massive street protests against him. Charamba was heavily involved in the negotiations that eventually led to Mugabe stepping aside. *AFP*

French soldiers accused of child rape in CAR off the hook

PARIS - French investigating magistrates have closed a probe into allegations that the country's soldiers raped children in the Central African Republic while on a peacekeeping mission, judicial sources said Monday.

Members of Operation Sangaris, deployed to keep warring militias apart, had been accused of abusing children at a camp for people displaced by the fighting in 2013 and 2014.

But magistrates dismissed the

prospect of a trial saying there was not "sufficient evidence", according to their ruling, seen by AFP. The state prosecutor had last year called for the case to be closed. While admitting "it is not certain that no sexual abuse took place", the prosecutor said that "differences" in the testimonies of the children who came forward made it impossible to establish guilt among the troops.

The allegations were first reported by the British newspaper The Guardian in April 2015, tamishing

the reputation of the French military. The Guardian reported that six children aged nine to 13 had said they were abused in a camp in CAR's capital Bangui, in return for food and money.

The Childhood and Sharing civil group will appeal the magistrates's decision to dismiss the case, lawyer Rodolphe Constantino said. ECPAT, an international organisation against the sexual exploitation of children, will also likely appeal, according to lawyer Emmanuel Daoud. AFP

KING'S CHILDREN LAMBAST TRUMP, **CONDEMN RACISM ON #MLKDAY**

ATLANTA — Two of Martin Luther King Jr.'s children and the pastor of his historic Atlanta church marked the national King holiday Monday with sharp denunciations of President Donald Trump, focussing on disparaging remarks he is said to have made about African countries and Haitian immigrants.

Angry pro-Haiti protesters and Trump supporters yelled at each other from opposite sides of a street near the president's Florida resort.

At gatherings across the nation, activists, residents and teachers honoured the late civil rights leader on what would have been his 89th birthday and ahead of the 50th anniversary of his assassination in Memphis, Tennessee. But in the many speeches delivered from pulpits and podiums across the country, Trump's name came up nearly as often as King's, with speakers indicating that

his turbulent presidency was undermining efforts to ease racial tensions in the US.

The president spent his first Martin Luther King Jr. Day in office buffeted by claims that during a meeting with senators on immigration last week, he used a vulgarity to

describe African countries and questioned the need to allow more Haitians into the US. He also is said to have asked why the country couldn't have more immigrants from nations like

In Washington, King's eldest son, Martin Luther King III, criticised

Trump, saying, "When a president insists that our nation needs more citizens from white states like Norway, I don't even think we need to spend any time even talking about what it says and what it is.'

He added, "We got to find a way to work on this man's heart."

In Atlanta, King's daughter, the Rev. Bernice King, told hundreds of people who packed the pews of the Ebenezer Baptist Church that they "cannot allow the nations of the world to embrace the words that come from our president as a reflection of the true spirit of America."

"We are one people, one nation, one blood, one destiny. ... All of civilisation and humanity originated from the soils of Africa," Bemice King said. "Our collective voice in this hour must always be louder than the one who sometimes does not reflect the legacy of my father."

'Very normal' US parents charged with torture of 13 children

PERRIS - An emaciated 17year-old girl escaped a home in Perris, California, early Sunday morning where she had been held captive alongside her 12 brothers and sisters in filthy conditions, according to police.

Authorities arrived at the home to find several children shackled to beds with chains and padlocks, "in dark and foulsmelling" conditions, the Riverside County Sheriff's Department said in a news

The parents, David Allen Turpin, 57, and Louise Anna Turpin, 49, have been arrested on charges of torture and child endangerment. Their bail is set at \$9 million each (about R111 million). They were "unable to immediately provide a logical reason" why their children were shackled and chained, authorities said.

Sheriff deputies were "shocked" to discover that seven of the "children" in the home were actually adults, according to the news release. The ages of the 13 victims ranged from 2 to 29. They appeared malnourished and dirty, and told authorities they were starving. News24

US readies North Korea invasion force

SOAL - At US military bases across America, more than 1 000 reserve soldiers are getting ready to be moved overseas.

They will practise setting up mobilisation centres, which quickly ship troops abroad to warzones.

As the Winter Olympics kick off in South Korea next month, the Pentagon is also thought to be considering sending more Special Operations soldiers to the Peninsula.

Special Ops have been deployed to large global events before - like the 2014 World Cup in Brazil - but their numbers will supposedly be far greater this year.

The deployment could see the for-

mation of a Korea strike force ready to cripple Kim's dictatorship.

The US will also carry out military exercises this year where troops are placed in chemically contaminated environments that could be found in North Korea.

Special Ops will also work to counter weapons of mass destruction - including nuclear and ballistic missiles.

At Fort Bragg in North Carolina last month, 48 Apache gunships and Chinook helicopters practised moving troops and equipments under live artillery fire.

Two days later, 119 soldiers parachuted out of C-17 military cargo

planes in a simulation of a foreign invasion.

The Army's Chief of Staff, General Mark A Milley, is worried that US troops have forgotten how to fight a land war.

He said: "Do not wait on orders and printed new regulations and new manuals.

"Put simply, I want you to get ready for what might come, and do not do any tasks that do not directly contribute to increasing combat readiness in your unit."

The US and its allies have already stepped up military drills in a bid to intimidate Kim.

Palestinian leaders reconsider recognition of Israel

PALESTINE - The Palestine Liberation Organisation's (PLO) Central Council, the second-highest Palestinian decision-making body, has recommended revoking recognition of Israel until the latter recognises the State of Palestine in its 1967 borders, with East Jerusalem as its capital.

During a meeting in the occupied West Bank city of Ramallah late on Monday, the PLO, which is an umbrella of major Palestinian political parties, said it "assigned" its Executive Committee "to suspend recognition of Israel until it recognises the State of Palestine on the 1967 borders and revokes the decision to annex East Jerusalem and expand and build settlements," according to Wafa, the official Palestinian Accords, withdraw recognition of such actions could take some time. news agency.

In a final statement read after the meeting, the PLO also said that the Oslo Accords, signed with Israel in the early 1990s, "no longer stand".

It added that it would renew its decision to "stop security coordination [with Israel] in all its forms and called on all Arab states "to sever all ties with any state that recognises Jerusalem as the capital of Israel and transfers its embassy to

But several Palestinian political parties expressed their reservations on the final statement, saying the language was vague.

UK Air Force scrambles jets

LONDON — Britain's Royal Air Force scrambled two fighter jets to intercept Russian bombers near UK airspace on Monday, in another illustration of ongoing tensions. The RAF confirmed a "quick reaction alert," deploying Typhoon aircraft from the Lossiemouth base in Scotland as two Tupolev TU-160 Blackjack bombers approached Britain." The Russian aircraft were initially monitored by a variety of friendly nation fighters and subsequently intercepted by the RAF in the North Sea," the air force said.

Kashmir border violence kills nine

SRINAGAR – At least nine people including four Pakistani soldiers were killed in fighting in disputed Kashmir on Monday, India and Pakistan said.

The Pakistani army said four of its soldiers and three Indian troops had been killed in an exchange of fire across the heavily militarised de-facto border known as the Line of Control (LoC). India denied it suffered any casualties, but said its soldiers had killed five "militants" who attempted to cross the LoC in a separate incident in Uri, 100km northwest of the main city of Srinagar. ATHENS - A moderate but shallow 4.4magnitude quake jolted Athens on Monday evening, the national observatory and experts said. The quake had a depth of just five kilometres (3.1 miles) and an epicentre 24 kilometres northeast of the Greek capital. It was followed by weaker aftershocks, the observatory said. "The 4.4-magnitude earthquake was felt across the capital and as far as Lamia and Corinth," Efthymios Lekkas, head of Greece's state earthquake planning and protection organisation told state television ERT. AFP

Schools shut as volcano spews lava

MANILA - The Philippines' most active and volcano spewed lava that cascaded downslope and emitted ash that fell on nearby towns, state volcanologists said vesterday, prompting the provincial government to shut more schools. The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) recorded nine episodes of tremor, four of which accompanied lava fountains, and 75 lava collapse events as pressure builds up leading to lava flows and ash plumes, reiterating its warning that a hazardous eruption could happen any time.





PELE BACKS BRAZIL TO WIN SIXTH WORLD CUP

BRASILIA - Footballing legend Pele said on Monday that Brazil are favourites to win the World Cup in Russia, four years on from their humiliation on home

Five-time winners Brazil were thrashed 7-1 in the 2014 semifinals by eventual champions Germany at the Maracana, but Pele, considered one of the best players of all time, insisted that new coach Tite has formed a team ready to put his country's painful memories to

"Those who are Brazilian and believe in Brazil always point to Brazil as the favourites," the 77-year-old said while attending the opening ceremony of the Rio de Janeiro league.

The 'Selecao' romped to qualification as winners of the South American group, with Tite building an excit-

ing side featuring the world's most expensive player Neyman and new Barcelona signing Philippe Coutinho.

"One of the good things that happened was the arrival of Tite, he's making a team," Pele added.

"In the last World Cup we had the best players in the world but the team was disorganised.

"It seems that now we'll have a team and a Selecao that gives us confidence."

Pele, who won three World Cups with Brazil in 1958, 1962 and 1970, has been struggling with ill health and Monday was his first public appearance with a zimmer frame, having attended December's World Cup draw in a wheelchair.

"I'm fine, thank goodness, and I want to thank all those who sent me messages wishing me a good recovery from all over the world," he said.

Giggs' father ashamed of him

... After Ryan had affair with brother's wife

LONDON - Ryan Giggs' father says he is 'ashamed' of his son, who he says stabbed brother Rhodri in the back after having an affair with his wife, Natasha, and not apologising.

Speaking after Giggs was appointed as Wales Manager on a a fouryear contract, Danny Wilson told The Sun: "I should be the proudest dad in the world, as happy as a lark by what he's achieved - but I am ashamed of him.

"I can't even bring myself to use his name - I refer to him as the exfootballer."

News of Giggs' affair with his sister-in-law emerged in 2011, after it emerged the Manchester United hero had also had an affair with former Big Brother contestant Imogen Thomas.

Exposed

He paid £150 000 for a gagging order over his tryst with Thomas but was eventually exposed in parliament by then Liberal Democrat MP John Hemming, who used parliamentary privilege to break the court order.

"I just felt sorry for him. He had a nice wife, nice children, nice home, nice life. He obviously wasn't happy with it."

After being unveiled as Wales boss on Monday, Giggs dismissed scrutiny over his own international record as 'unfair'.

Giggs was regularly criticised for withdrawing from Wales squads - particularly for friendly matches - during a career where he played 64 times for his country.

BACKGROUND

Swaziland adheres to a number of international, regional and national instruments that express commitment for the promotion of gender equality commitments, namely the 1995 Beijing, 2004 CEDAW and the 2007 SADC Gender Policy. These pledges recognize the promotion of gender equality as a development objective and a prerequisite for sustainable development. Such recognition and commitment calls for appropriate measures to ensure the full realization of equitable sustainable development that leaves no one behind through national policy and programme interventions. The domestication of the various instruments led to the Government of Swaziland (GOS) developing the National Gender Policy in 2010.

The Beijing Plus 20 Outcome Document, and its First 10-Year Implementation Plan, both adopted in 2015 have been translated into the SADC Protocol on Gender and Development for alignment by the Members States. Additionally, the global community, including Swaziland endorsed, Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Africa Union Agenda 2063. These instruments foster gender equality across the 17 SDGs, and further embrace and close interface with culture in the AU Agenda. The country has taken the initial steps to integrate these two in unison, into the National Development Strategy (NDS), Vision 2022, for realisation of inclusive gender-responsive outcomes.

Sustainable development participation and opportunity deviation status for the country was assessed through the 2016 Swaziland Gender Development Index. The Index revealed progress made regarding the social-related development in particular in the education sector. Economic opportunities and women participation in decision-making however lag, in particular when considering that women parliamentary representation is recorded at 15%. Access to credit and production tools and skills remain low contributing to the high unemployment rate of 40% amongst women versus 28.1% of the general population. Maternal mortality rates remain high with access to quality services challenging the public health sector. On the other hand, the national surveillance mechanism on the gender-based violence indicates an increase in reported cases and more women and children than men falling victims.

Gender indifferent sectoral policies and strategies limit the ability of the country to translate the gender equality mainstreaming agenda, and combined with inadequate monitoring and evaluation (M&E) tools the national resources allocation requires a review to enhance commitment through resource allocation and targeted results and timeframes.

The 2010 National Gender Policy capacity to drive effective national institution coordination through the Deputy Prime Minister's Office (DPMO) Department of Gender and Family Issues (DGFI) remains deficient of benchmarked national performance targets along the 2015 Agenda 2030 SDG 5 and the AU 2063 Agenda. Promotion of comprehensive gender mainstreaming and protection of human rights ensuring coherent gender definitions and conceptualisation for improved understanding of gender equality process and its integration in the various sectors has to be achieved, hence the call for the review of the Gender Policy.

A team of an International Consultant (IC) and a National Consultant (NC) is required to undertake a comprehensive valuation of the 2010 National Gender Policy under the leadership of the Department of Gender and Family Issues and develop a comprehensive costed Strategy Action Plan (SAP) with and M&E Framework and indicators. The International Consultant will lead in achievement of the assignment deliverables with support by the National Consultant. The team of consultants will work closely with the Technical Working Group (TWG) that will be established by the DPMO.

The ageless Swiss marvel, rated as the favourite to win his 20th Grand Slam title, thrilled the Rod Laver Arena crowd with a virtuoso per-

The second seed cruised to a 6-, 6-4, 6-3 win in 1hr 39min and will next p' German Jan-Lennard Struff.

Federer is coming off an er raordinary 2017, when he won a fifth Australian Open title and record eighth at Wimbledon, after returning irom an injury lay-off.

He said the margin the elite players had over others helped them to make successful comebacks from injuries, pointing to himself last year, and Rafael Nadal, Novak Djokovic and Stan Wawrinka at this year's Open.

"I think because we maybe have a margin against a lot of the players normally, when we do come back, we can maybe find that level," Federer said. "Even though we're not feeling good, we can still find a way and eventually play good again, whereas others would struggle early on and it becomes more difficult.

"I think then because of our results, we just back ourselves. Mentally and physically we're going to be there. AFP

Mkhitaryan key to Sanchez Utd deal

LONDON - Manchester United's bid to sign Alexis Sanchez from Arsenal hinges on Henrikh Mkhitaryan moving the other way, the Armenian player's agent said yesterday as Antonio Conte distanced Chelsea from a potential deal.

Chile international Sanchez, who appears to have played his last game for Arsenal, had been strongly linked with a move to either Manchester United or Manchester City and Chelsea boss Antonio Conte has also spoken of his admiration for the player. The player, who is out of contract this summer, had appeared certain to sign for Pep Guardiola's team after a transfer fell through in August but it is understood City have pulled out of the race for the 29-year-old due to the costs involved.

There has been speculation Mkhitaryan will be offered as a makeweight from United to land Sanchez, and Mourinho left the playmaker out of the squad to face Stoke on Monday due to "doubts about his future".

Mkhitaryan's agent Mino Raiola told Britain's Times newspaper that Sanchez's transfer to United was reliant on his client joining Arsenal as part of the deal.

MELBOURNE - Garbine Muguruza wore heavy strapping on her injured right thigh as she laboured to a 6-4, 6-3 victory against wildcard Jessika Ponchet in the Australian Open first round yesterday.

The world number three took an hour and 24 minutes to quell the virtually unknown 21-year-old French world number 256.

Muguruza said before her match she was hoping to be "pain-free" to begin her Australian Open campaign, but her mobility was hampered and she looked anything but fully fit against Ponchet.

A quarter-finalist in Melbourne last year, Spain's Muguruza dropped her first service game but from there battled back to take the first set in 43 minutes. "It wasn't easy. I didn't know anything about her," said



Muguruza of her opponent who was making her first main draw appearance in a WTA event, let alone a Grand Slam.

"She's super talented. Serves and volleys, so I had to stay very concentrated."

The Wimbledon champion had a problematic start to the year, pulling out of the Sydney International to protect her right thigh.

Only a week earlier she had retired

from the Brisbane International with severe cramps. Her bad luck almost continued when she clutched her left knee as her shoe stuck awkwardly in the court at 2-2, 30-30 in the second set, bringing gasps from the Margaret Court Arena crowd.

But she recovered to outlast Ponchet in a game that went to a marathon six deuces and take a break of serve and then broke again to seal the win. Muguruza, seeded three, next faces Taiwan's Hsieh Su-wei who prevailed in a see-saw match against China's Zhu Lin 0-6, 6-0, 8-6.

The two-time Grand Slam winner is in the same half of the draw as world number one Simona Halep and is projected to face another French woman, number eight seed Caroline Garcia, in the quarters.





Gamedze was shot dead just before 7pm that Sunday evening as he was about to leave the Galp Filling Station in Ezulwini. He had been travelling from the stadium when he met his death. Swallows coach Vilakati says Gamedze's death is still hard to believe.

Mr Gamedze treated us so well. He was a straightforward person and would tell you directly when you did something that he didn't like," he said.

Recounted

Vilakati then recounted his last conversation with his late boss.

"We were always communicating. So as usual we communicated a lot in the build up to the match on Sunday.

He called me on Saturday at about 2pm and we spoke about various things including if we had settled plans for camp for the team. He called me again on Sunday at 4am and we spoke.

At 12:15pm on Sunday I called him to tell him my line up for the match. We then saw each other during the match and after that I saw him, which was my last time seeing him. I went to the Lobamba Police Station to collect our gatetakings and while I was there we spoke on the phone again and his last words to me were, "okay call me after you have collected the money and tell me how much we got." So after I had collected the money I tried calling again but he wasn't picking up," a sad Vilakati narrated.

Gamedze will be buried on Sunday at his parental homestead in Siteki, Ka-Langa after a night vigil. His memorial service will be held at the Prince of Wales Ground in Mbabane on Saturday from 11am.

Gamedze was shot dead at Galp Filling Station in Ezulwini on Sunday evening, just moments after his Swallows side had beat Wanderers 1-0 in the quarterfinals of the SMVAF Ingwenyama Cup at Somhlolo National Stadium. Gamedze was travelling from the stadium when he met his death.

Yesterday, Wanderers released a statement, sending their condolences to the Gamedze family and the whole Swazi nation.

"Manzini Wanderers Football Club would like to offer our deepest condolences to the Gamedze family and all relevant affected stakeholders, on the passing away of Mr Victor Maradona' Gamedze.

Gamedze who chaired the Premier League of Swaziland's Executive Board; the Mbabane Swallows Football Club; and the board of Swazi Mobile (our sponsors), was a visionary without peer in local football.

He lived the sport in many capacities, and left a telling mark," the statement reads. In their statement, the Weslians paid tribute to Gamedze who, before his death, had conjured up a sponsorship deal for the Manzini giants through his new

mobile company Swazi Mobile. "It is very painful that Gamedze met his untimely death returning from a football match in which his beloved Mbabane Swallows had just played our team for a place

in the semi-finals of the Ingwenyama Cup.

He was the main initiator of the Swazi Mobile sponsorship to Manzini Wanderers and three other football clubs currently receiving financial

support from Swazi Mobile. For this, Manzini Wanderers Football Club remains grateful and will forever be indebted to this departed soul," the statement continued. The Manzini giants added in the statement that only God would be able to heal the wounds left by Gamedze's passing while also requesting the nation to give the police the space and time to properly investigate the murder.

"Manzini Wanderers shares in the grief suffered by his family and Mbabane Swallows and the entire football community, and fully understands that at this moment, the only person who can heal the pain is God the Creator - to whom we encourage all the suffering to look to for solace.

Noting that his passing away is a sad, painful and highly sensitive matter, we appeal for calm and an end to the wide-spread speculations from the public. Let us kindly offer space and opportunity for the police to investigate the matter to a fruitful conclusion. *Madvudvu bo Madlenya*," the statement, released by Sandile Dlamini on behalf of the club's board of directors, concluded.

I told Gamedze they were lucky I wasn't playing - 'Taribo'

SOCCER - MANZINI Wanderers striker Mfan'futhi 'Taribo' Bhembe says he last spoke to slain Mbabane Swallows boss Victor Gamedze on Saturday evening.

'Taribo's' best days were with Swallows under Garnedze's leadership where he established himself as one of the club's greatest strikers of all time.

The forward, who now plays for Swallows' rivals Wanderers, says he last spoke to his former boss Gamedze on the eve of the two sides' SMVAF Ingwenyama Cup quarterfinal clash which was played at the Somhlolo National Stadium.

"To be honest, I am lost for words, I'm speechless. I would like to firstly pass my condolences to the family, his children and everyone affected by this loss. I was like a son to him and he was like a father

to me. This is just so unbelievable," Bhembe told this publication at the Gamedze home in Dalriach yesterday.

The dreadlocked striker then narrated the last conversation he had with Gamedze.

"I last saw him in person on Friday at the (Ingwenyama Cup) kit presentation. We last spoke on Saturday on the phone.

I called him just to tell him that I wasn't in the squad for the match and told him that Swallow was lucky I wasn't playing. We had a good laugh and he said we would talk after the match on Sunday. When I first heard the news on Sunday evening, I thought he would recover. I just hope the people who did this will be found soon," Bhembe said.

Gamedze was killed in cold blood at Galp Filling Station in Ezulwini on Sunday just before 7pm. He suffered two gunshots around the head and neck area and was confirmed dead upon arrival at Medi Sun clinic.

Somber mood at Sigwaca House as Gamedze's passing sinks in

SOCCER-IT was a somber mood at Sigwaca house on Monday morning as the Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) and National Football Association of Swaziland (NFAS) came to terms with the tragic passing of slain Mbabane Swallows boss Victor Gamedze.

Sigwaca is the building that houses both the PLS and NFAS in Mbabane.

In both organisations, the late Gamedze occupied top positions. He was the chairman of the PLS while he served as vice president at the NFAS. On Monday morning, the first day of work after Gamedze's death, who had been murdered in cold blood on Sunday evening Sigwaca was incredibly quiet and in a somber mood.

When the Swazi Observer's repoter arrived at the building at around 11.30 in the morning, PLS staffers in the first floor were found praying.
On the second floor, which hous-

On the second floor, which houses the FA, football administrators including the likes of Mbabane Swallows General Manger Sandile 'Beyond 2000' Zwane and FA CEO Frederick Mngomezulu were found in conversation by the stairs. A visibly distraught Zwane left the building soon afterwards.

Soon after that, Minister of Sports, Culture and Youth Affairs David 'Cruiser' Ngcamphalala, who was also visibly sad, arrived and was followed by Minister of Information, Communications and Technology (ICT) Dumisani Ndlangamandla along with other football administrators and senior government officials. The officials converged in a separate room, presumably preparing for a press conference which had been scheduled for noon that day.


Members of the media started filling the conference room and waited



for several minutes. The officials then emerged lead by Minister Ngcamphalala. The incredibly tense and sad conference lasted for about 10 minutes. FA President Adam 'Bomber' Mthethwa opened the conference before Minister Ngcamphalala delivered his short statement to the media in which he passed on his condolences to the Gamedze family.

Soon after the conference, Sihlangu coach Pieter de Jongh was seen arriving at Sigwaca.

He spent about ten minutes inside the building before leaving. Before leaving, the coach spoke to journalists and expressed his shock at the demise of Gamedze who also served as Chairman of the national side Sihlangu's Special Projects team.

NYANGA'S LAST MOMENTS WITH VICTOR GAMEDZE

SOCCER - MANZINI Wanderers head coach Nyanga 'Crooks' Hlophe, who is also a former Mbabane Swallows coach was the last person to converse with murdered PLS boss Victor 'Maradona' Gamedze at Somhlolo National Stadium before he met his untimely death at the Ezulwini Galp Filling Station minutes later.

Recalling the moment, the emotional 'Crooks' said he was still shattered and shocked with Gamedze's demise, especially the fact that it happened moments after their conversation.

Gamedze was seen rushing to 'Crooks' after a brief conversation with Swazi Observer Sports Editor Mphikeleli Msibi when making his way outside the Royal Box after the final whistle where his beloved Swallows had grinded a hard fought narrow 1 - 0 against the 'Crooks' led Manzini Wanderers.

"I heard his voice from afar and immediately looked back because he was yelling the name 'bayakwazi', which we invented together back in 1990 when Sihlangu beat Zambia at Somhlolo National Stadium.

"Gamedze came to me with a huge smile on his face. He started heaping praises and marveling at the development I had done with the team. He further stated that he had never seen such a solid Wanderers side in years, stating that he was confident the team would be

the coming seasons." Nyanga said after their chat, Gamedze then gave him a 'big' hug before walking away. "Little did I

know it was the last time I would see or hear from him again because a few minutes later before I even left the stadium, 'Koki' came rushing to tell me that Gamedze had been shot. I did not believe him but it

turned out it was true.

"Now that all this has happened, it feels like he knew this was going to be our last moment together because even those around me were shocked as to why he was congratulating me so much yet we had just lost to his team."

Hlophe described Gamedze as a

'Gamedze was like a son to me because as a person who once trained him, I became more of a father figure and our relationship continued over the years. When he was my boss at Swallows, he appreciated my honesty and that kept us close.

"I would like to offer my sincere condolences to the Gamedze family and the football fraternity as a whole. This is a major loss to us because Gamedze was still very young and was still to do a lot of things for the development of the sport in the country.

"Lastly, let me mention that there is no life that deserves to be taken away, less of all with such cruelty.

We hope the long arm of the law will catch up and punish the monsters, who committed this despicable crime."

Gamedze will be laid to rest on Sunday at his parental homestead in Siteki, Ka-Langa after a night vigil. His memorial service will be held at the Prince of Wales Sports Ground in Mbabane on Saturday, starting at 11am.

Birds players recount last moments with boss Gamedze

SOCCER-MBABANE Swallows players have recounted the last moments they spent with their slain boss Victor Gamedze.

Gamedze was murdered in cold blood on Sunday evening at Galp Filling Station in Ezulwini, just moments after watching his side beat Manzini Wanderers in the quarterfinals of the SMVAF Ingwenyama Cup at Somhlolo National

Yesterday, the players, led by the club's senior officials including General Manger Sandile 'Beyond 2000' Zwane and coach Thabo 'Koki' Vilakati, went to the Gamedze family home in Fonteyn, Mbabane to extend their condolences to the family of their murdered boss.

Speaking to this publication, Swallows senior player Wonder

'Samba Jive' Nhleko said the death of their boss had come as a huge

"Eish, this is too sad for us. This took us all by surprise, we are still shocked. We last spoke with him on Sunday during halftime of our match. He came into the dressing room as usual and gave us a few tips as he usually did.

"We last saw him then and after that we heard reports that he had been shot. It was like a dream to us. I am only starting to believe now," he said.

Nhleko went on to add how Gamedze's demise would negatively impact their lives. "His death will affect us a lot. We won't forget his love and affection. He had this warmth in the way he treated us," a sombre looking Nhleko added.

Meanwhile, star attacking midfielder Felix Badenhorst, who was visibly distraught and close to tears during the interview, described Gamedze as a father figure to all the players.

"It is very difficult. I don't know what to say. I just don't know what to say. He was like a father to us. He changed how we think and used to make us feel like we were the best in Africa. At halftime during our match against Wanderers he came in the dressing room as usual and motivated us. I last saw him in the tunnel as I was walking out to do an interview. That was the last time I saw him," a teary-eyed Badenhorst said.

Captain Tony Tsabedze said he was failing to console his teammates as they come to terms with the death of their boss. "I can't talk honestly; I just don't know what to say. This is like a dream. I don't know what to tell my teammates, sometimes we call each other and we just stay silent on the phone. There is nothing to say," Tsabedze

The Swallows captain added that Gamedze had been to their training sessions at the Prince of Wales ground last week as they prepared for the Wanderers match. "He came to training as usual and we spoke. Then on Sunday he also came into the dressing room at halftime. It was all normal; he was just his normal self, motivating us. Now that he is gone, we have to play for him," Tsabedze concluded.

Some of the other players present were young starlet Sizolwethu 'Nunu' Shabalala, mifdfileder Banele 'Pupu' Sikhondze, left back Sanele Mkhweli as well as goalkeepers Sandile 'Nkomishi' Ginindza and Sandanezwe Mathabela. Other officials present were trainers Siyabonga Bhembe and Etienne Massoye as well as Manager Lwazi 'Zidane' Maziya.
