



### Parliament not in contempt - AG

PARLIAMENT is not in contempt of court by the resolution it took regarding senate hopefuls who lost in the recent general elections.

The House of Assembly on Tuesday took a resolution to disqualify senate hopefuls who lost in the elections. This was despite that the high court had given them the green light to stand for election into senate.

Some members of the public, including legal minds viewed what was done by parliament as contempt of court.

However, Attorney General Sifiso Khumalo was of a different view.

Khumalo said it was important for the resolution to have been understood before people could comment if this was contempt of court or not.

He said Parliament was not party to the order issued by the High Court on the matter.

Therefore, the order could not be binding to parliament. Also, the order had not been served to Parliament.

However, be that as it may, Parliament did acknowledge the fact that there was a court order issued, which concerned the senate hopefuls that lost in the recent general elections. It was not like the order was disregarded by Parliament.

However, implementing the order could be premature as the order was not before Parliament and Parliament was not party to the proceedings.

Khumalo also mentioned that he would make further comments once a written judgment was issued by the High Court.

Comment

Law Society of Swaziland (LSS) Secretary Thulani Maseko said it would be difficult for him to comment on the matter, especially because he had not yet seen the order of the court. He said sometimes, it was possible for courts to issue orders and find that those orders gave a certain time frame to the con-



cerned parties to implement them. The House resolution reads: "Having noted the judgment of the High Court of Eswatini relating to Section 5 (3) of the Senate (Elections) Act No. 7, 2013; Taking into consideration the fact that the written judgment on the matter is yet to be issued

Cognisant of the fact that this may eventually need an amendment to be effected on the existing legislation; However, pending the issuance of the written judgment, which may lead to the whole legislative process being put in motion and the law amended in accordance with the court ruling;

The House therefore resolves that It would be premature and out of order to allow candidates, that are currently barred by the Senate (Elections) Act No. 7 of 2013, to participate in the Senate elections."

# SSA DISMISSES EMPLOYEE OVER IRRESPONSIBLE FACEBOOK POST

A Swaziland Sugar Association (SSA) employee was dismissed over an insensitive and irresponsible Facebook post.

Mpendulo Perfectionist Simelane of Hluthi in the Shiselweni region was dismissed yesterday morning after an insensitive post on rape.

Without repeating the exact malicious words used by Simelane, his post gave a general impression that rape survivors have no right to recollect themselves and walk around with self-confidence. It further suggested that rape survivors should remain humble and be submissive to men.

The fired Simelane completed school at Siteki Nazarene High and studied Business Information Technology at Limkokwing University of Technology and also studied Computer Science engineering at the University of South Africa according to his Facebook page.

Thabile Maripe, Public Relations & CSI Specialist at Swaziland Sugar Association confirmed that Simelane has been relieved of includities at the company as of yesterday morning. He was with the Information and Technology Department at SSA and he was working at the Simunye office.

Maripe said Simelane joined them on June 1, this year and he was working

on a contractual basis. SSA distanced itself from the facebook post which they said belittled women and the impact of rape.

"It is with heartfelt regret that Swaziland Sugar Association (SSA) learnt this moming of vile utterances on a Facebook post wherein the profile of the user had a link to our organisation. Sadly, the Facebook post belittles women and the impact of rape. SSA would like to categorically distance itself from the utterances made and summarily state that the organization strongly condemns such vile disregard for women and their

abuse," she said.

Maripe continued to say that SSA upholds human dignity, and integrity as one of its strongest values.

She said that such utterances do not only counter the organisation's ethical standards but also sets back years of lobbying for the regard of women and human rights, particularly at a time when the world is experiencing appalling numbers of cases of rape and gender-based violence.

"The SSA ethics and code of conduct also condemns and forbids such behaviour as in the Facebook post. Accordingly, SSA disassociates itself from such awful and insensitive statements. The said user is no longer employed by SSA. The Facebook post and its subsequent effect to the public is hugely regretted," she added.

People have been critiquing the insensitivity of the post on Facebook and it opened wounds to rape survivors some of whom were going through psychological assistance. Simelane was labelled a pervert who is a perfectionist in stinging rubbish.

# Public condemn barbaric act of mocking rape survivors

MEMBERS of the public condemned what could be best described as a barbaric act of mocking rape survivors.

Users of the social media were emotional after noticing a reckless post, allegedly posted online by one Mpendulo Perfectionist Simelane who ridiculed rape survivors.

He has since been fired from work. Without repeating the exact malicious words used by Simelane, his post gave a general impression that rape survivors have no right to recollect themselves and walk around with self-confidence. It further suggested that rape survivors should remain humble and be submissive to men. The disheartening post was subsequently re-posted by concerned users on another popular 'gossip group' known as Sgungu SeMgosi without Borders.

Members of the public vented their frustration and disbelief at the level of cruelty displayed by the author of the post, saying that he was being heartless and insensitive towards the people who have experienced the unfortunate occurrence.

One Sithembiso Dlamini, a professional psychotherapist expressed shock on how some people can reach a point of making jokes out of sensitive realities which have negatively affected hundreds of other people's lives. Dlamini said it was shocking to learn that some people had the courage to rub salt on healing wounds of rape survivors.

"As a peer counsellor and educator trained by SWAGAA some 10 years ago, I feel so heart broken right now," Dlamini retaliated on his post

Meanwhile, another user who alleged to have survived rape also posted and voiced out her sadness following the reckless post made by Simelane.

"I am alone and have been crying after ngibone le post yaMpendulo ahlekisa ngerape, ngibuhlungu kunke buhlungu ngatsi lentfo yenteke itolo. I was raped ngaMarch this year and I am seven months pregnant ngendeaba yekudlwengulwa, shotsi nawa raped lomunye umuntfu ukubona useless..." reads part of the painful message posted by another Facebook

the United Nations and international partners to replicate global best practice in engaging men and boys for prevention of GBV and dismantling negative stereotypes through a Men Engage Network.

She said this was an example of a platform that multiple organisations and the people of Eswatini-who want change can commit to support.

She stated that in adopting a trensformative approach, SWAGAA was implementing a school based Boys for Change' programme in collection with the ministry of education in an endeavor to inspire a generation of boys and men who change the narrative, refuse to perpetrators of violence unashamedly stand for social and gender justice.

### SWAGAA frowns at insensitive Facebook post

SWAZILAND Action Group Against Abuse (SWAGAA) is appalled by the derogatory statement reported to have been posted on Facebook by a man named Mpendulo Simelane.

When sought for comment on the post, SWAGAA Communications and Advocacy Officer Slindelo Nxumalo said apart from compromising the country's developmental agenda, this is a grave human rights violation and first and foremost should be seen as a brutal attack on the rights of women and the dignity of survivors of rape.

"Such hate speech is intolerable as it promotes discrimination and victimisation of women, GBV survivors and in this case rape survivors. Survivors of GBV and rape are inundated with pain, feelings of shame, unfounded self-blame, fear, terror, a sense of low self- esteem, victimisation, intimidation, no justice; the

list is endless. The last thing they need is a society that allows such inhumane opinions which fuel the lies and fears.

Additionally, women are not sex objects and have the right to decline unwanted sexual advances and should be allowed to do so without fear of ridicule, violence and sexual harassment, and all men must respect that!

### **Experiences**

Furthermore, the traumatic experiences they face do not define who they are. Women are courageous, full of strength, wisdom, integrity, dignity and worth. They are human beings," she said.

She said that the fact that a statement of this nature signifies an inherent hatred for women and disregard for the injustice women face at the hands of chauvinistic, misogynistic men cannot be taken lightly.

"It is a very serious matter to note evi-

dence that educated, professional individuals still hold onto damaging heinous views about women and their experiences. It is also frightening that individuals who hold these perceptions are still in positions of power and influence and have access to public or private communication platforms! As a matter of urgency, concrete steps must be taken to ensure that such hate speech is denounced and prevented in all spheres, as it fuels hate crimes and violence against women and children, especially girls," she added.

Nxumalo said this is a call to action for all sectors to take responsibility in promoting an environment that prevents and punishes acts of gender based violence both in the workplace and elsewhere and to do nothing is to condone the violence and to allow it to thrive.

### FOUR PRISON OFFICERS RUSHED TO HOSPITAL AFTER CLASH WITH INMATES

FOUR officers from His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) were rushed to the Mbabane Government Hospital after they sustained severe injuries following a bloody clash with inmates who wanted to escape from the Sidvwashini facility.

The four officers include two warders and two wardresses.

According to His Majesty's Correctional Services Public Relations Officer Gugulethu Dlamini the chaos erupted after lunch at around 1:30pm yesterday.

She said the inmates are usually afforded an opportunity around that time to call their relatives and friends. She said the inmates usually go in a group of five. She said during that aforementioned time, one inmate requested to go and empty a rubbish bin which was by the facility, which the officer agreed to.

"After allowing him to empty the bin, the inmate is said to have charged towards the officer, assaulted him and demanded the jail keys," she said adding that the inmate was then joined by the four other inmates in executing their escape plan. It is said that the inmates heavily assaulted the officer with some of the working tools that were temporarily stored in the entrance of the facility offices. These tools that were used to assault the officer included garden spades, forks, rakes etc.

The inmates were however disturbed by a police officer from the Royal Eswatini Police, who was at the premises of the facility to collect food parcels for suspects who are still in the police cells," she explained.

The police officer is said to have realised

what was going on and fired warning shots in the air.

### Dispersed

The inmates then dispersed and ran towards some female officers who were busy with their admission paper work.

"The inmate then held hostage the two female officers," she added. They (inmates) commanded the officers to tell their colleagues to disarm themselves as they threatened to kill them if they did not do so.

The female officers are said to have screamed for their lives, and with the screams the two other officers were able to locate the whereabouts of the inmates.

The Royal Eswatini Police officer fired more warning shots in the air, but that did not scare or disperse the inmates as they continued to hold hostage the

"One of the officers is said to have rang an alarm which then alerted the other officers that something amiss was going on. The officers after hearing the alarm then went to the facility to rescue the officers who were in danger," she said.

Dlamini said one of the inmates tried to leave the facility but he was caught just at the guard house where he tried to fight an officer but failed as the officer proved stronger than him.

She said the four officers were rushed to hospital as they were heavily assault-

"We are still doing our investigations so for now we cannot state where they were severely assaulted," she said mentioning that they were at the Mbabane Government Hospital undergoing some medical tests.

### 20 women needed in Parliament

A total of 20 women are currently needed in Parliament, out of the possible 24 vacancies available.

This follows that five women have already been voted into the Senate by Members of Parliament (MPs). The elections of the five women took place in the House of Assembly on Tuesday afternoon.

This means that Parliament now has a total of 10 women.

The electorate elected only two women into the House of Assembly and they include MPs Thandi Nxumalo and Lady Howard Mabuza from Manzini South and Mafutseni, respec-

His Majesty King Mswati III appointed three women into the House of Assembly, adding the number of women in the House of Assembly to five.

The three women include Princess Lindiwe, Princess Phumelele, and Pholile Shakantu.

Five more women were elected into Senate on Tuesday afternoon by the House of Assembly, according to Section 94 (2) of the Constitution, which says: "Ten senators, at least half of whom shall be female, shall be elected by the members of the

House in such manner as may be prescribed by or under any law at their first meeting so as to represent a crosssection of the Swazi society."

The election brings the number of women in Parliament to 10. The five elected women include Leckina Magagula, Lizzy Nkhosi, Winile Nxumalo, Busi Dlamini, and Khanyisile Malambe.

Currently, His Majesty the King is expected to appoint 20 senators, at least eight of whom will be females, according to Section 94 (3) of the Constitution, which says: "Twenty senators, at least eight of whom shall be female, shall be appointed by the King acting in his discretion after consultation with such bodies as the King may deem appropriate."

The current vacancies in Parliament are 20, according to the Constitution. However, the appointments expected will be the ones determining if there is a need for the four women from the regions to be elected or not.

If the 20 remaining appointments completely constitute females, there will be no need for the females to be elected from the region.

However, if the appointments constitute both males and females, there will be a need for the four women to be elected, and that will bring the number of available vacancies to 24.

### ...Inmates in for murder, rape, house breaking

THE five inmates are waiting for their murder, rape and house breaking trials at the facility.

Speaking to this publication at Sidwashini Correctional Services Facility yesterday, HMCS PRO Gugulethu Dlamini said the five inmates were in prison for multiple murder, rape and housebreaking and theft cases in the country.

"They are going to be charged for

this," she said further adding that they will be charged by the police; however the correctional services can also lay internal charges.

She said the inmates damaged telephones, computers, windows, dockets and many more.

She said the area was heavily vandalised by the inmates.

She said the correctional services will

as of now implement new tight security measures to make sure that this doesn't occur again.

"The five will be currently kept under maximum security since they have proved to be very dangerous," she added.

Dlamini therefore urged other inmates not to try this as it is a very dangerous game that can put many lives in dan-







# STATE OPPOSING COMPANY'S URGENT APPLICATION TO OPERATE DAGGA FACILITY

THE state is opposing an urgent application filed by a local company that wants to be granted a licence to operate a factory which will manufacture drugs for medicinal purposes using dagga.

Umjono (PTY) Limited yesterday filed an urgent application at the High Court where it is seeking an order directing government to grant it the licence within seven days.

The urgent application was yesterday before High Court Judge Doris Tshabalala and representing the applicant in the matter was Mbabane based lawyer Linda Dlamini of Mabila Attorneys in Association with N. Ndlangamandla and S. Jele.

The minister for health (although not in office) was represented by government senior lawyer Vikinduku Manana from the attorney general's chambers.

Manana filed a notice of intention to oppose the application and the matter will now take its normal course as opposed to be heard under a certificate of urgency as the state stated that currently there is no Cabinet in place.

Cited as the applicant in the matter is

the company (Umjono) and the minister for health and the attorney general have been cited as the first and second respondents, respectively.

Directors and shareholders of the company are Sabelo Lusolotja Ginindza, Bheki Trevor Shongwe, and Macedziphathi Dlamini.

According to Shongwe in his founding affidavit, the company is seeking an order directing the minister for health to consider its application to operate the medical research facility centre for purposes of extraction, derivation, production and manufacturing of drugs for medical purposes in the Kingdom of Eswatini.

### Submitted

Shongwe submitted in his affidavit that after having been incorporated in January 2016, the company proceeded to apply for and was issued with a trading licence by the ministry of commerce, industry and trade.

He alleged that the company then embarked on a study on how cannabis and/or dagga might be utilised for health or medicinal purposes.

In his founding affidavit, Shongwe submitted that it was found that dagga or cannabis could be very useful and beneficial to the people of Eswatini.

He submitted that the study by his

company revealed that cannabis could be quite useful for a number of medical ailments from which the populace was suffering.

The ailments, according to Shongwe, include inter alia: Alzheimer's which is a disease characterised by a progressive loss of memory. He told the

court that patients with Alzheimer's were also likely to experience depression, agitation and loss of appetite.

According to Shongwe, dagga contains tetrahydrocanabinol (THC) and that production and manufac-THC and its turing of drugs for medical analogs may provide an improved ther-

apeutic option for Alzheimer's disease by simultaneously treating both symptoms and the progression of the dis-

purposes."

Other ailments which he alleged could be treated through drugs manufactured from cannabis include diabetes mellitus, dystonia, epilepsy, gastrointestinal

disorders, cancer, hepatitis C, human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), hypertension, incontinence. Multiple sclerosis, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), pruritus and rheumatoid arthritis. Shongwe alleged that amongst these HIV\AIDS symptoms as well as side effects of ARV treatment cane be treated by the

dagga if extracted for medical purposes and that the estimated costs of the dagga medical facility stands at E150 million.

He averred that his company had at its disposal medical experts to elucidate to the court the benefits of administration of cannabis or its extracts. Shongwe said the applicant (company) was prepared to parade the experts if so required and applied before court to allow the applicant to bring the experts to assist it (court).

He submitted further that as indicated that this is a research and/or study carried out by the applicant, the need to establish a medical research centre for administration of cannabis and/or its extracts on patients arises, hence the applicant is desirous to embark on such an exercise.

He alleged that the applicant engaged the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) and sought alliance for the establishment of a cannabis medical research

Shongwe averred that, following several discussions between the applicant and UNESWA, the latter being represented by the Eswatini Institute for Research in Tradition Medicine, Medicinal and Indigenous Food Plants (SIRMIP), a draft agreement to the build, operate, own and transfer of research, development and cultivation facility at Mafutseni was prepared.

Shongwe submitted that the material terms of the agreement were that his company would among other things, construct the medical research centre at Mafutseni and to procure the capital to fund the establishment and the facility; assist with further research into plant material to a point of commercialisation; assist traditional healers in terms of correct dosage and cultivation and research original Swati landrace material in order to produce unique end products for the medicinal cabinet market to compete on a global stage.

He further claimed that, in conjunction with the university, it was agreed that they would establish sophisticated research, development and cultivation facilities and create unique genetics.

Shongwe told the court that on the other hand, UNESWA was to, among other things, provide sufficient information to enable the company to perform its obligations under the agreement and also give the applicant unfettered access to the physical area under its control, staff, relevant information and resources.

# 6 ARRESTED IN KABHIZA CHAOS, FOUR INJURED

FOLLOWING the bloody clash between KaBhiza tenants and the community of Mbhuleni who are calling for the closure of the infamous drinking spot, four people have been injured.

Police have already arrested six peoved to be solved in the inciarch saw property to the value of E27 000 destroyed. Yesterday those who are believed to be ring leaders of the whole saga were rounded up and interrogated by the police on the events leading to property including refrigerators, jukeboxes, windows, cars and pool tables being vandalised. Allegations are to the effect that when the Mbhuleni community members marched to KaBhiza bar demanding that everyone vacate the place, a fierce fight crupted between the community and those working at the

drinking spot. The battle saw a lot of people getting injured as dangerous weapons such as knives, bush knives, knobkerries and stones were used during the fight. It is alleged that after police intervention, the fight between the two parties subsided, however, it is said as soon as police left, the community and those working at the drinking spot were back at each other's throats. It is said a gang from KaKhoza and Moneni was brought in and they went around caus-

ing havoc, attacking residents while they were sleeping in their respective places.

In the process, it is alleged that a number of people were injured and taken to RFM hospital. The police have confirmed that they have received four reports of people who were injured during the skirmishes. Police yesterday rounded up six of those who are suspected to have taken part in the violent acts.

They were kept at Sgodvweni Police station for the better part of the day and they are expected to make their first court appearance tomorrow at the Matsapha Circuit Court.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Phindile Vilakati confirmed that police have arrested six people. She said there were four cases of assault which were opened with the police. Vilakati added that for the assault cases one is assault common while three of the other cases are assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm.

### Senior Officers from Manzini Regional Headquarters intervene

SUPERIOR police officers from the Manzini Police Regional Headquarters yesterday paid a visit to Sigodyweni police station.

Even though the purpose of their visit was not clear, the officers are said to have had a word with those involved in the violence that took place at Mbhuleni after community members clashed with tenants of KaBhiza sheeben.

This was after the community made it clear that they were fed up with the drinking spot which opens 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The residents said the drinking spot had turned into a place where prostitution, murder crimes, robbery and other social ills take place. The residents complained that even the police are failing to close down the place hence they have since decided to kick out those who are renting the place



to sell alcohol by force.

Worth noting is that it has been reported that on several occasions when police officers try to close down the shebeen, they are met with resistance as patrons fight with them. In some instances some police who have gone to raid the place end up running for their dear life trying to save themselves from the rowdy patrons. What makes it harder for officers during raids is that the place is encircled with a high wall fence and has one gate which makes it hard to flee to safety once cornered.

### Contraceptive prevalence rate increases

ESWATINI is in the right path when it comes to family planning measures, statistics have indicated that.

Contraceptive prevalence rate is getting high in the country.

This information was shared by United Nations Population Fund's (UNPF) Margaret Thwala-Tembe during the launch of the State of World Population Report 2018 titled 'The Power of Choice: Reproductive Rights and the Demographic Transition.'

The launch was held at the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) Kwaluseni Campus. Thwala-Tembe said the launch of the report coincided with the World Poverty Day which falls on October 17, for the simple reason that freedom in the exercise of reproductive rights has a major bearing in poverty eradication.

She said the 2018 report shows how family size, whether small or large, is intertwined with reproductive rights.



Where rights are realised, people tend to thrive. Where they are not, people are not able to realise their potential, and fertility rates tend to be higher or lower than what most people really want.

Thwala-Tembe said these realities are also evident in the Kingdom of Eswatini as the Multiple Indicator Cluster Surveys (MICS) have consistently shown that improvements in family planning lead to general improvements in the health

and wellbeing of women and children. She said for example, between 2010 and 2014 Eswatini's contraceptive prevalence rate increased from 65 per cent to 66 per cent whilst the average number of births per woman declined from 3.7 to 3.3. Likewise, the adolescent birth rate also declined from 89 to 87 births per 1 000 adolescent girls age 15 to 19 years. The Officer in Charge said this is a clear indication of the benefits of

choice

She said when women have the freedom to exercise their reproductive rights they tend to manage their fertility desires in ways that not only benefit them as individuals, but the benefits also extend to the family, community, the nation and the world at large.

"The health of their children also improves. The MICS surveys further show that the mortality of children under the age of five years, is, to a large extent, related to a woman's ability to access contraception." She said the improvements in contraception had contributed to the drop in under five mortality, for example the drop has been from 104 to 67 deaths per 1 000 live births between 2010 and 2014.

"This report makes the case that choice can change the world. Choice is about having the power and the means to make your own decisions about whether, when or how often to have children, and how that power affects other choices in life. Choice is a right," she said.

### CANGO CALLS FOR THE PROTECTION OF JOURN

THE Coordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations (CANGO) has called for the protection of all media practitioners.

CANGO Communications Officer Nkosingiphile Myeni said they have noted with concern the persistent attacks on journalists while in the line of duty.

"This is freedom of expression, a human right enshrined in the Bill of Rights and guaranteed by other international rights treaties which the Kingdom of Eswatini has rectified," he said.

Myeni said on October 4, the acting Qatar Ambassador to the Kingdom of Eswatini Yaqoub Yousuf Al Mulla

is said to have temporarily detained two local journalists at the Qatari Embassy in Mbabane.

The journalists are said to have refused to sign a non-disclosure arrangement because they were pursuing a story of public interest.

"This therefore led to their temporal detainment at the embassy and was released upon the involvement of the police on the embassy's claims that they broke-in," Myeni said.

On September 26, during the march to petition the US Embassy in Ezulwini, a mob of members of the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) assaulted a photojournalist.

He added that the photojournalist's camera was confiscated by the teachers during the attack.

Myeni also mentioned that at

Siphofaneni market vendors recently attacked a journalist and blamed the media for the loss of national elections by a Member of Parliamentcandidate. Thankfully, he was saved from the mob by transport operators while police merely acted as peacemakers other than law enforcers against a crime committed.

"On August 30 another journalist was beaten by the Royal Eswatini Police Services (REPS) in conjunction with His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) officers and forced to delete photographs taken during a textile workers' protest against poor pay in Nhlangano," he said. Another journalist was forced by police to delete pictures of government vehicles taken while parked outside the Deputy Prime Minister's Office in Mbabane.

Meanwhile, Myeni said CANGO is concerned that as the country is expected to achieve vision 2022, how would that be possible if such attacks continue unabated.

Myeni noted that there is a crucial role that is played by journalist in the country that is the dissemination of information, education and entertainment. "Should media practitioners be victimised for pursuing stories of national and public interest, as a country we risk producing information-starved generations, especially if their rights are not protected," he said. He said more protection could be provided by security agencies than merely condemning such through the state media.

Private sectors and civil society were urged to call for these to be protected in solidarity.

# PUPIL STABBED AT NGWANE PARK PRIMARY, RUSHED TO HOSPITAL

WHAT started out as a fighting game between two pupils at Ngwane Park Primary School, ended badly when one of the pupils was stabbed and had to be rushed to hospital.

It is said the Grade Seven learners were playing behind one of the classrooms yesterday morning when the incident took place.

It is alleged that while the pupils were playing, one of them got stabbed in the nose with a pen. The injured pupil is said to have bled profusely which resulted to one of the teachers deciding that he be rushed to hospital to seek medical attention.

Both parents of the pupils were later called by the school and were engaged in talks.

Confirmed

Three teachers at the school at first claimed to be unaware of the incident when a team from this publication paid them a visit, but after a number of teachers were called, one of them confirmed that indeed such an incident hap-

He said the administration had already called the parents.

The teacher said he was going to report the incident to the deputy but was still getting in touch with the parents as they said they were on their way to the school.

The teacher said the pupil was accidentally stabbed in the nose.

He said it was a minor incident which is why they did not even call paramedics when the accident occurred but simply sent the child to hospital. The teachers said they did not even involve the police as it was nothing much but a mistake.

### Supreme Court confirms umbutfo's murder conviction, 15-year sentence

CONVICTED and sentenced to 15 years imprisonment by the High Court, a murder convict yesterday had his appeal against conviction on the murder charge dismissed by the Supreme Court of Eswatini.

Thembinkosi Thumbela had filed an appeal at the Supreme Court, where he was challenging a judgment handed down by High Court Judge Doris Tshabalala, who found him guilty of the murder of Muzi Ndwandwe and subsequently sentenced him to 15 years imprisonment.

Judge Tshabalala found him guilty of murder with extenuating circumstances.

In the present appeal application, he had appealed against the entire judgment as he felt that he should have been found guilty of a lesser crime of culpable homicide.

Satisfied

Supreme Court Judge Majahenkhaba Dlamini, sitting with Chief Justice Bheki Maphalala and Justice Robert Cloete when handing down judgment yesterday, stated that he is satisfied that the court a quo (High Court) correctly convicted the appellant (Thumbela) of murder, hence the appeal should be dismissed.

Judge Dlamini stated that there is no appeal against the sentence and rightly so as in his opinion the appellant got off fairly lightly with the sentence of 15 years.

"This verdict was premised on the existence of intention in the form of dolus eventualis inferred from the surrounding circumstances of the case. The requisite elements of intention are present,

### 'Deceased was killed in a brutal manner'

JUDGE Tshabalala, who convicted Thumbela, for Ndwandwe's murder said in arriving on an appropriate sentence, she took into account the factors brought to her attention by the defence counsel.

That included that the accused person was a first offender.

However in the same vein, she took into account other relevant factors, namely the gravity of the crime, brutal manner in which it was executed and not the least, the interest of society.

The judge had also considered the importance of finding that extenuating circumstances exist in the murder charge, the court may ullimate death sentence that is otherwise permissible under the Constitution of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

the appellant does not even say he was under the influence of dagga which was found in a bag allegedly belonging to him which he disowned. Both the alcohol and dagga would of course most probably be defeated by reason of being selfinduced," Justice Dlamini said.

Dolus eventualis means intent in the form of dolus eventualis or legal intention, which is present when the perpetrator objectively foresees the possibility of his act causing death and persists regardless of the consequences, suffices to find someone guilty of murder.

Justice Tshabalala said in considering the impact of drunkenness as a mitigating factor in the circumstances of this case, she must be guided by the authority of the Supreme Court of Eswatini in the case of Mgubane Magagula Vs the King.

That said, Justice Tshabalala said in her judgment that also imposed a punishment that fits the criminal as well as the crime, punishment that is fair to society and is blended with a measure of mercy, according to the circum-

She stressed that the offence committed by Thembinkosi calls for a severe sentence to serve as deterrent to others and curb this type impose any suitable sentence other than the of senseless crime of violence and considered the 15 years imprisonment as appropriate.

Both the chief justice and Justice Cloete agreed with Justice Dlamini after reading the judgment with Thumbela quietly leaving the accused's dock.

The Supreme Court noted that the evidence by the crown was very much consistent as to how the deceased was flung and hit against the wall of the veranda.

The court also noted that the deceased was dragged and hit by the appellant over a period of time and how the deceased was pulled by his dreadlocks, causing him head injuries and finally dragged to the road where the deceased and the appellant were eventually found by the police.

He said last year, they offered their counselling services to UNESWA students.

Shabangu said their hands are open to anyone who is willing to share their problems with them.

He promised that shared problems would be between that individual and them.

### Petros Mavimbela is 12th Speaker of the House of Assembly

NEW House of Assembly Speaker Petros Mavimbela is the 12th legislator to hold the position since 1967 when Msindazwe Sukati was elected the first speaker.

The speaker and his deputy Phila Burneiezi have aiready been biessed by His Majesty King Mswati III.

Mavimbela will hope to finish his term to join the ranks of Nicholas S'kakadza Matsebula, Prince Guduza and Themba Msibi who all finished their terms in charge of the House. Former Nkilongo MP Trusty Gina is the only legislator who had the privilege to hold the position of speaker twice between 2004 and 2006, but on acting basis in both tenures

Lobamba Lomdzala MP Marwick Khumalo had the shortest time as speaker, assuming the position in February 2004 before he was replaced by Gina the following month.

He was Lobamba MP at the time. Other legislators who assumed the position of speaker include former Ngwempisi MP Mgabhi Dlamini, and former SBIS broadcaster and Lobamba Lomdzala MP Charles 'Sgayoyo' Magongo.

As new speaker of the House of Assembly, Mavimbela is expected to decide whether a bill is an appropriation one or a money bill other than an appropriation bill before the bill is sent to the Senate, among other duties.

This is contained in Section 112 and 113 of the Eswatini constitution which is where duties of the

speaker in the House of Assembly are detailed.

The speaker is elected by the House, either among its own members (other than ministers) or from among persons who are not members.

The holder of this office is a Member of Parliament (MP) who has been elected to be speaker by other MPs or appointed by His Majesty King Mswati III.

Mavimbela was elected by MPs last Thursday, beating former Speaker Themba Msibi to the seat.

He attained 47 votes against 22 by Msibi.

Some of his duties entail keeping order and allowing MPs a platform to raise issues in the House.

The speaker is the chief officer and highest authority of the House of Assembly and must remain politically impartial at all times.

Section 112 (1) says that when a bill that in the opinion of the speaker is an appropriation bill is sent to the Senate from the House, that bill shall bear a certificate of the speaker that it is an appropriation bill. (2) Where a bill passed by the House and certified by the speaker as an appropriation bill is sent to the Senate, that bill shall forthwith be introduced in the Senate and passed by the Senate without delay.

Section 113 (1) states that when a bill that in the opinion of the speaker is a money bill other than an appropriation bill is sent to the Senate from the House, that bill shall bear a certificate of the Speaker that the bill is a money bill other than an appropriation bill.

### 'Use natural resources to start businesses'

Tfwala of Edlozini area under Chief Nsukumbili has been slapped with nine counts of theft by false pretences.

Yesterday, he appeared before Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini to answer

Whilst employed by Yester Investments as a manager, he was entrusted with the care and responsibility of receiving money from customers who were paying the company which was acting as an agent by buying cars on behalf of the customers from Japan.

### Accused

The accused person is said to have unlawfully and with intent to defraud and steal, misrepresented to his victims that Yester Investments would purchase vehicles for them in Japan. By means of the said misrepresentation, he obtained from them different amounts of money totalling E139 750.


Tfwala is said to have obtained E7 500 from Leonard Dlamini, E25 000 from Garlie Mamba, E10 000 from Ernest

### CIC members decry lack of tenders and delayed payments

**CONSTRUCTION Industry** Council (CIC) members have decried lack of offers and delayed payments due to the country's economy crisis.

The submissions were made during the launch of the industry association regulatory policy which was held at the Happy Valley yesterday.

After presenting the summary of the policy, CIC Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Nhlanhla Dlamini opened the floor for comments and suggestions.

Sandile Makhubu from the Swaziland Associations of Architects, Engineers and Surveyors (SAAES) said the industry is between a rock and a hard place as there were no offers or tenders and payments are delayed or not done at all owing to the country's economy crisis.

"We are not doing enough to help the situation, but instead we are taking two steps forward and four steps back; there is no consistency.

Crafting A lot of effort is put into crafting the policy but when it must come into effect, we pull in different directions. There is a big gap between the associations and the Council and before we close that gap, we are not going forward

We should find a solution that will give us direction and that entails constant meetings and interactions to look into issues and statistics that will give us a clear picture of where we stand," he said.

On that note, CIC's CEO concurred with Makhubu and further confirmed the economic crisis.

He said they were in a process of getting the statistics on delayed payments and non-payments to address how the industry is performing and then present it to government.

Objectives of the regulatory policy are to facilitate effective and

engagement of industry players with the council, ensure members of the industry associations get value from membership. It will ensure effective participation of industry players in the industry, to ensure industry associations operate professionally to the benefit of its members, to continuously obtain input and feedback from industry participants through the industry association structures and to regulate fees paid by participants in the indus-

The regulatory policy was met with resistance from the members as they felt there was a lot to be considered before the policy comes

They want the policy to be interrogated by all relevant stakeholders, aligned with the constitution and ensure it protects the small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

Loopholes CIC Chairman Dan Dlamini said the loopholes picked by the members were because of lack of commitment from associations who did not attend meetings but were quick to shift the blame when problems arise. He challenged the associations to show a high level of organisation and commitment for every-

thing to flow smoothly. The CIC has four industry associations as members and these are the Swaziland Contractors Association (CSA), the Swaziland Associations of Architects, Engineers and Surveyors (SAAES), the Swaziland Association of Indigenous Engineers (SAIE) and the Building Material and Suppliers Association (BMSA).

The launched policy serves as guiding framework for the operations of the construction industry associations and their interactions with the Construction Industry Council. It addresses functions of the industry associations, the governance of the industry associations, fees charged to membership and conflict resolution, among other things.

# Granny (70) beaten for supposedly practising witchcraft

AN old woman aged 70 has been beaten two times for loitering in graveyards at night.

Maria Sithole of Malindza was allegedly found by two men from a Simelane family loitering at a neighbour's graveyard last week.

She was allegedly beaten by the men who also caught her nearly three months

One of her assailants is said to have been on his way to pick up his local girlfriend when he was suddenly startled by a moving shadow down the family graveyard.

He supposedly dashed back to his flat to take his knobkerrie before going to his older brother's flat to alert him about the discovery.

The two brothers are said to have gone

to the graveyard to confront the old woman. It is said that the elderly was given a chance to explain her 'visit' which was

not satisfactory to the two and they pro-

It is said the two accused the old woman of bewitching their family.

She was beaten with open claps and the knobkerrie all over her body.

After some serious beating, it is said the old woman apologised to her attackers.

The elderly woman is said to have told the two brothers that she was sleep-walking and had no idea where she was, same line she used a couple of months ago when she was first caught at the graveyard.

Dragged

She was then dragged by her clothes by the Simelanes and dumped by her gate. It is believed that the assaulted elderly crawled to her daughter-in-law Buyile Dlamini's doorstep, where she banged the door and yelled for help.

As she did on the first instance, Sithole is said to have refused to go to the hospital, saying she was scared that the Simelanes would finish her off while there.

She is currently being nursed by her daughter-in-law for the injuries she sustained which are mostly on the head and the torso.


Sithole, who has been previously accused of being responsible for the death of some members of the Simelane family, has been supposedly warned by the Simelanes numerously. She resides just a few kilometres from the Simelane homestead with her daughter-in-law and two grandchil-

"They just hate her, I do not believe that my mother-in-law was anywhere near their graveyard when they attacked her," said Dlamini.

Dlamini said her mother in-law has never hurt anyone. She explained that she would know if her mother-in-law was practising or involved in the said witchcraft because she stays with her and she has never seen anything peculiar.

Dlamini pointed out that her mother-inlaw only use herbs for minor illnesses such as headaches and open wounds like any other Swati citizens.

When contacted, a Simelane family member said they were tired of losing their beloved through unclear causes. He said Emaswati would understand why their neighbour was beaten.

# UNESWA LEGAL CLINIC WINS MKHULU'S BATTLE

THE Legal Clinic of the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) has won an adoption battle on behalf of an old man who wanted to adopt his grandson.

Lawrence Mandlenkhosi Dlamini (76) of Mbikwakhe approached the Legal Clinic seeking legal assistance in the adoption of his grandson. The Legal Clinic is a division under the university's Law Department that provides free legal service to members of the public who cannot afford it. It is made up of a group of final year law students. The Clinic has successfully moved an application at the High Court on Dlamini's behalf, seeking an order allowing him to legally adopt the minor. In his founding affidavit, Dlamini informed the court that he was moving the application to adopt his grandson identified as Lindelani Gracious Mamba who was born on May 18, 2000 out of a union between his daughter Xolisile Dlamini and one Sikhumbuzo Mamba. He said the two were never married and his daughter died on December 2, 2001.

"My grandson was born with a disability as he is deaf and he is unable to speak. Due to his disability he was hardly accepted and I have always made sure that I exclusively provide for him. To this end, the Mbikwakhe royal kraal is aware that I stay with my grandchild and his predicament. Presently, my grandson is doing Grade 7 at the School



for the Deaf in Siteki and I am the one who is solely responsible for his education," he said.

Dlamini submitted that Mamba acknowledges that he (Dlamini) is responsible for the child. He said he had made request to Mamba for him to legally adopt the child through a letter.

"I am advised and verily believe that for purposes of this application I must prove that the adoption is in the best interest of the child and the child is an orphan and or has been neglected. As explained above, since the child was born with a disability he is constantly discriminated and I fear that when I am not alive he will suffer.

He might even be sidelined by my own children. I am an old sickly man in my advanced years and I might die anytime.

If I legally adopt my grandson he can benefit from the little that I have as my lawful child. I can rest in peace knowing that at the very least he has roof over his head," he submitted. Attached to the court papers is a socio economic report compiled by social workers from the office of the deputy prime minister.

According to the report, Dlamini's family is united and they fellowship at the Catholic Church.

"Information gathered revealed that most of the family members do not take alcohol. The child in question was born with a disability of being deaf. He is able though to communicate with the family members using sign language. The applicant mentioned that he is able to relate with other family members. He further said that they are psychologically healthy but the grandmother to the child in question revealed that she has high blood pressure problems which is controllable," states the report. The High Court has since granted Dlamini his wish to adopt the child.

"Having heard both counsel for the applicant and the respondents and there being no appearance for the first respondent having read papers filed of record it is hereby ordered as follows: that the applicant legally adopts Lindelani Gracious Mamba as his child, that the third respondent (Registrar of Births, Marriages and Deaths) is hereby directed to approve and change the surname of Lindelani Gracious Mamba to Lindelani Gracious Dlamini. The third respondent is hereby directed to cause to be registered and issued a new birth certificate of the child under the name Lindelani Gracious Dlamini," read the court order.

Dlamini was represented by Manzini based attorney Muzi Motsa and Sibusiso Nhlabatsi who appeared for the Legal Clinic.

### E16M MILLING FOR MATSANJENI FOLK

FORMER Hosea Indvuna Yenkhundla Thulani Shiba's family has opened a milling company, an investment of over E16 million.

The business is situated at Siphambanweni near Matsanjeni in Lavumisa and it is operating under the branding Siphambanweni Milling. The company which has changed the face value of the community started operating early last month. THE new milling company opened at Matsanjeni near Lavumisa will create job opportunities for over 65 people.

The people of Matsanjeni heaped praises to the Shiba family for opening the company in their community. Others said it has been stressful to travel long distance to buy only one bag of mealie-meal. "Some of us have been crossing to South Africa to buy mealemeal and now that we are to have it right here, it's a great relief. Those who are maize farmers, they are no longer going to suffer as at times they needed to hire vehicles to sell the maize in faraway places. said one of the residents.



POLICE stationed at Mhlumeni Border Gate on Monday nabbed a Mozambican man who was in possession of dagga which he carried in a plastic bag.

The Mozambican man, Massava Mario Andre (52), was heading to his home country when he was nabbed at the searchpoint within the border gate premises.

He appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso yesterday where he faced a charge of contravening Section 7 as read with Section 8 of the Opium and Habit Forming Drug Act 37 of 1922.

The accused person is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully possessed 3.8 kg of dagga, a potentially harmful drug without being a holder of a valid permit. When his rights to legal representation were explained to him, the accused elected to conduct his own defence.

He subsequently pleaded guilty to the charge. His plea was also accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence.

During mitigation, the accused asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying he was a first time offender.

He alleged that he intended to use the dagga for medical purposes, claiming to be suffering from asthma. The accused was accordingly found guilty and sentenced to six months in a correctional

facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine. It is alleged that locally produced dagga is highly sought after in neighbouring countries which include Mozambique and South Africa. For this reason, there has been an ever increasing number of suspects being arrested at the borders while attempting to smuggle the illegal herb to the said countries.



### MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE (MR)

OVER the past weekend, local newspapers broached the subject of the ever-increasing number of new cancer cases in Eswatini, which, according to the Director of Health Services Dr Vusi Magagula, has seen cancer rise to becoming the third deadly disease in Eswatini after HIV and tuberculosis (TB).

Data from the 2016 situational analysis of cancer statistics shows the most common cancers in Eswatini to be cervical cancer (31.1%); Kaposi sarcoma (28.7%); prostate cancer (10.5%); breast cancer (6.3%); lung cancer (4.1%); liver cancer (3.6%); esophageal (1.6%); stomach cancer (1.3%); skin cancer (1.3%); and vulvar cancer (1.1%).

For people living with HIV, the risk for developing certain cancers such as Kaposi sarcoma, non-Hodgkin lymphoma, and cervical cancer (in women) and penile cancer (in men) are very high.

Cervical cancer is the most frequently diagnosed cancer in Eswatini. It develops in the cervix, the neck of the uterus.

The main cause of cervical cancer (almost 80%) is the human papillomavirus (HPV which is transmitted through sexual intercourse and intimate skin-to-skin contact.

Infection rarely shows symptoms and the risk factors include: starting sexual activity at a young age (early sexual debut); high number of sexual partners of women and of their partners (leading to multiple diseases); having a sexually transmitted infection, multiple pregnancies; smoking; being overweight (obesity); and a weak immune system.

# Growing burden of cervical cancer cases cause for concern in effort to end AIDS

CERVICAL CANCER

The relationship between HIV and some cancers is attributed to the HI virus which attacks the immune system, reducing the body's natural protections from infections and diseases.

A weaker immune system is less able to fight off diseases, like cancer. People living with HIV, especially those not on treatment, often have a weakened immune system thus have a greater chance of getting cancer.

The concern in the HIV response is that infection by one of the viruses (HIV or HPV) may accelerate transmission of the other.

Evidence is available that HPV infection has been found to significantly increase the risk of HIV transmission for both men and women.

Women living with HIV who become infected with HPV are four to five times likely to develop pre-invasive lesions that can, if left untreated, quickly progress to invasive cancer.

To complicate matters, cervical cancer is an AIDS defining illness – declared in 1993 by the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

An 'AIDS defining illness' is one that is directly associated with advanced HIV infection.

This stage, in the life of a person living with HIV person, often signifies the development of AIDS. The very condition that His Majesty has succinctly pointed out, as needing to be ended by 2022.

The burden of cervical cancer predominantly affects women of reproductive ages 15-49. Studies have shown that the prevalence of HPV infection rises soon after the onset of sexual activity and peaks in adolescence and early adulthood, after which it declines during the later decades of life.

The high prevalence of HPV infection among young women has been found to be due to absence of adaptive immune response and the relatively larger area of cervical epithe-

lium (thin tissue forming the outer layer of a body's surface and lining the alimentary canal and other hollow structures) undergoing a harmless non-cancerous change (known as squamous metaplasia).

Women living with HIV who become infected with HPV are four to five-times likely to develop pre-invasive lesions that can, if left untreated, quickly progress to invasive cancer.

### RISK FACTORS FOR CERVICAL LESIONS AMONG HIV+ WOMEN

Compared with HIV negative women, HIV positive women are more likely to be infected with HPV and to have persistent HPV leading to precancer, larger and more difficult to treat precancerous lesions, higher recurrence rates of pre-cancer following treatment, and precancerous lesions that progress more rapidly to invasive cancer.

Several studies clearly show an increased risk of rapid progression to cancer among HIV positive women.

For Eswatini, evidence on the risk factors of cervical lesion among women living with HIV is provided by a cross-sectional study conducted to determine the prevalence and risk factors for cervical lesions using visual inspection with acetic (VIA) among 112

HIV positive and 161 negative women aged 18-69.

The women were recruited from three referral hospitals that provided VIA and cryotherapy, namely Hlatikhulu Government, Mbabane Government, and Raleigh Fitkin Memorial Hospitals.

Titled 'Screening, prevalence, and risk factors for cervical lesions among HIV positive and HIV negative women in Swaziland' by Joll et al.

BMC Public Health (2017), the study concluded that the presence of cervical lesions was greater among HIV positive (22.9%) than HIV negative women (5.7%). %).

In the age-adjusted model women who had two or more lifetime sexual partners were three times more likely to have cervical lesions compared to women with one lifetime partner and the odds of cervical lesions among women with a history of STIs were 2.16 greater than among women with no previous STI.

In the adjusted model, women who had a previous cervical exam were 2.5 times more likely to have cervical lesions than women who had not.

Cervical cancer is an illness that can be prevented by vaccination against HPV and that is curable if detected and treated early – sexually active women need to have regular Pap smear examinations.

Unfortunately, in the country, there

is a low uptake of women screening for cancer of the cervix, and many go late for screening.

### THE GOOD NEWS

In August 2015, the ministry of health responded to the previous paucity of data in relation to high HIV infection and the high rate of cervical cancer by re-establishing the national cancer registry and initiating activities aimed at increasing access to screening of reproductive cancers, including cervical and breast cancer. The national registry focuses on cancer surveillance, screening, treatment and palliative care for cancers.

The good news is that the National Strategic Framework on HIV and AIDS 2018-2023 has included opportunistic infections and co-morbidities as programmes of focus as the country strives to attain AIDS free status.

This will lead to a reduction of cancer morbidity and mortality through the implementation of evidence based cost-effective prevention and control interventions and providing palliative care to improve the quality of life for people living with cancer and their families.

Though October is designated Breast Cancer month, the ministry of health through Dr Magagula, has encouraged people to not only concern themselves with breast cancer but to access other cancers check-up services, available in clinics and hospitals for free.

He also revealed that the ministry is also considering providing Human Papilloma vaccination to girls and women before they are exposed to the virus.

This October and beyond, let us all screen for cancer and if need be, get the needed treatment. It begins with you and together we can save lives.

There is much praying going on today around the world. There are prayer movements that are happening. The most powerful kind of prayer movement is what I call biblical praying.

must never neglect the secret place of prayer. We must not neglect it personally nor in our ministry, among our staff, among the teams that work with us.

In the last one year, God has done many things in our ministry beyond anything I would imagine or dream. It is a great temptation for me to get busy in the work of revival and of evangelism that God has called me to, that I neglect the secret place with God. God wants us to do through each of us more than we've dreamed or imagined. But as we see God moving and doing things, it is a great temptation to forget what God wants above all else is relationship. He wants fellowship with us. He wants us to draw away into that quiet place and meet with Him and get to know Him. Jesus said we should not get caught up in the religiosity of the day.

### The power of prayer

The second thing I want us to see is the power of prayer. Let us notice five principles that Jesus taught us here:

Principle of thanksgiving. "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name" — The first focus, when Jesus taught His disciples to pray, is not on their needs. The focus is on who Godis-the focus is upward, not inward, it is upward, not outward.

As we get our focus on Him, as we come into His presence, as we behold Him, as we worship Him, as we give praise and thanks unto Him-then everything else flows from that. As we see His heart, and who He is then we begin to pray according to what is on His heart and not what son our heart Powerful

praying is praying what's on the heart of God.

There are a lot of prayer meetings going on today, but too much praying is praying what's on our heart. Most of our prayer meetings are about our personal concerns rather than what's on the heart of God. When we begin to pray what's on the heart of God, He will do extraordinary things.

Principle of intercession. "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done" - If we see what's on His heart, we will pray what is on His heart. What is on His heart? The world is on His heart. If you pray for the kingdom of God to come and the will of God to be done, pray for the rule and reign of Christ in the hearts and lives of men and women; pray that men would come to repentance and faith in Jesus Christ - God is going to hear and to answer those prayers because that's what's on His heart.

Principle of supplication. "Give us this day our daily bread"—also known as the principle of God's provision.

This is going before God and saying, Oh, God, without you I cannot exist. I need you! I need sustenance from you. I need you to provide for me; see Him as our provider.

Principle of forgiveness. "Forgive our debtors" — As we go before God and see Him in His holiness, and in His greatness, we are broken before Him.

When we see God as He is in His holiness and His purity, He exposes the little things, the little hidden agenda in our hearts becomes exposed.

I have to go before Him and say, "Oh, God, it's not my broth-

er, nor my sister, but it's me. How I need You to cleanse me and forgive me".

There is brokenness that takes place, and cleansing. Forgiveness begins to flow, not only in us, but through us to others., as we forgive those who have sinned against us.

Then another principle "lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one" — God becomes our deliverer. He becomes the one who leads us and takes us on into victory. He gives us victory over the things that Satan will throw against us. We are in a spiritual battle. God will be our victor. He will be the one who will defend us.

These principle can be summoned up in one thing- the power of God. It is the power of changing the lives of men and women, the power of God providing for us to do His will, the power of cleansing us from anything that is displeasing to Him, the power of God delivering us from the evil one.

So when we pray, we need to understand that the reason revival descends on the wings of those who, are praying is because when we pray according to the Word of God, the power of God is released to accomplish His will

### PSYCHOLOGICAL abuse is a form of abuse that births all sorts of abuse.

You might have heard people saying 'it all starts from the head' or 'it's all in your mind' well the mind is a powerful tool that makes way to our actions.

Our body experiences, should it be that which we hear or see and touch is a gateway to our actions. One can state that it creates our inner self. Psychological experiences begin to develop as early as time of birth. All a child is exposed to and experiences forms his or her character that is, the way he/she would respond to aspects of life that he/she might come across. You should take note that the words psychological and emotional abuse will be used interchangeably.

Physical abuse, financial and sexual abuse are forms of abuse that are most spoken off and often emotional abuse is not treated as serious as the others.

What is most important to acknowledge is that without psychological abuse, the chances of the other forms of abuse to occur are very limited.

Domestic violence and abuse can happen to anyone, yet the problem is often overlooked, excused, or denied. This is especially true when the abuse is psychological, rather than physical. Noticing and acknowledging the signs of an abusive relationship is the first step to ending it.

By definition psychological abuse (also referred to as psychological violence, emotional abuse, or mental abuse) is a form of abuse, characterised by a person subjecting, or exposing, another person to behaviour that may result in psychological trauma, including anxiety, chronic depression, or post-traumatic stress disorder.

A discussion paper was prepared by Deborah Doherty and Dorothy Berglund on Psychological Abuse, from which abstracts of a child's development into an adult have been discussed and also stating how emotional abuse may be disturbed by the psychological abuse. We will consider some of the findings of the 2015 paper.

Individuals are pushed through life stages by biological and social demands. This is important because it infers that individuals cannot remain in a stage until they have properly confronted their crises, but may be forced to enter the next stage unprepared.

Therefore, properly managing crises within each stage is important for the successful completion of the later stages in adulthood. Erikson describes one of the first stages leading to adulthood as identity vs. role confusion (Logan, 1986). This stage is often expe-

rienced during the teenage years; in this stage adolescents experience an 'identity crisis', which is described as an attempt to define who you are (e.g. career, religion, sexual identity, and so on), where you are heading and how you fit into society. As adolescents progress through this stage, they begin to focus in on developing an identity. This identity consolidation in adolescence provides the first real opportunity to develop continuity with the past, meaning in the present, and direction for the future

. As such, identity consolidation forms the cornerstone of the capacity to do well and the basis of self-acceptance and self-esteem.

The successful resolution of identity issues provides the young person with a clear sense of self, well-defined personal beliefs and values, and a feeling of place within the community.

There are variables that take place throughout early developmental stages, which continue to affect individuals as they advance into adulthood. A variety of abuses such as verbal, mental, and sexual have been proven to negatively affect the course of children's life responses.

The most common form, which makes up 78.5 per cent of all child abuse cases is neglect. Neglect can be define das a type of maltreatment that refers to the failure by the caregiver to provide needed, age appropriate care although financially able to do so or offered financial or other means to do so. Abused children are also more likely to engage in sexual risk taking, causing them to be 25 per cent more likely to experience teenage pregnancy and putting them at a greater risk of contracting STD's. Abuse has also been linked with criminal behaviour and an alarming number of inmates have been abused mentally as children even though the numbers may be higher as most people do not know when they might be mentally abused as children, however, it is through a background interview at a later stage in life that researchers find out that the particular person had suffered emotional abuse at an early age.

It is important that psychological abuse be noted and taken seriously.

The country is faced with alarming news every week. Murder cases in the most inhuman manner; people committing suicide; children being sexually abused; school going children falling pregnant in school; mothers beating their children to death and spouses abusing each other. In all of these there is one connecting factor and that is psychological abuse of children.

### Universities need to take note of the gap between expectations, experience

THE student population at South African universities have changed dramatically in the last two decades.

It's now much more diverse in terms of age, race, culture, backgrounds, educational experience and academic potential.

This transformation has brought with it a wide variety of student expectations - largely influenced by their school experience, family background and home communities - about what a university education can deliver.

In my study, I examined the gap between first year students' expectations with their actual experience at a University in the Western Cape. The criteria I focused on were; social engagement, academic engagement and academic support.

The study revealed that there's a significant gap between incoming students' expectation of what university would be like, and their actual experience. This can lead to students feeling disconnected from the institution and could eventually result in them failing or dropping out.

To avoid this, universities must be well-prepared and properly engage with students before they leave high school and during their first year. This will help manage the diverse expectations and experiences that students have. For this research, I conducted two surveys. A first-year "expectation" survey was conducted with students before they entered university. An "experience" survey was then held towards the end of the academ-

The sample size was 95 first-year students of which 77per cent were female and 23per cent male. The majority of the participants (53per cent) were under 20 years old and were attending university directly from school. 40per cent of the participants were between 21 and 29 years old. Most of the participants (53 per cent) indicated English as their home language, while 23 per cent indicated isiXhosa and 21.5 per cent indicated Afrikaans. A large number of the participants (83 per cent) indicated they were first-generation students, meaning they were the first member in their immediate family to attend university. The Conversation

# ESWATINI'S GLOBAL COMPETITIVENESS RANKINGS WORSEN

ESWATINI's challenges seem to worsen by the day as the country has been ranked the 120th most competitive economy in the world, on the World Economic Forum's (WEF) Global Competitiveness Report of 2018-19.

Out of the 140 countries that participated, the kingdom's overall performance was 120th position. This is a decline of four places from last year's rank where the country stood at position 116 out of 137 countries. WEF released the latest rankings on Tuesday, amid the country's perennial economic challenges.

In the rankings, WEF measures competitiveness by considering 12 factors that would determine the level of productivity in a country, including institutions, infrastructure, macroeconomic environment, health, education, labour market efficiency, financial market development, technological readiness, market size and innovation.

The Federation of Swaziland Employers and Chamber of Commerce (FSE&CC) is WEF's implementing partner for the Global

### Eswatini's ability to compete compromised - FSE&CC

REACTING to the country's declining global competitiveness rankings, the Federation of Swaziland Employers and Chamber of Commerce (FSE&CC) says the degenerating state of affairs poses a huge concern to the private sector as it speaks to a reduced ability to compete on the global stage.

FSE&CC said the declining rankings are also a blow in the efforts to attract much needed foreign direct investment.

"The country needs to develop policies that will see Eswatini achieve double digit GCI rankings, in the next three to five years," FSE&CC said in a statement yesterday.

"Eswatini has been experiencing a steady inflation rate over the years; however rising public debt coupled diminishing reserves and elevated concerns about the macroeco-

Competitiveness Report.

While Eswatini's scores showed mixed results across all 12 pillars of competitiveness, it trailed

nomic stability of the country.

"Thus the country was ranked 115 under that pillar, which was one of the underperforming pillars," FSE&CC noted.

The cost of mobile data and services is one of the highest in the region, which results in low mobile and broadband penetration rates. Hence the country was ranked 125 under the pillar of ICT adoption, and consequently 134 under innovation capability, due to the close nature of innovation to a thriving ICT sector.

With an estimated life expectancy of 49.6 per cent the country is amongst the worst performing countries on this pillar, being ranked 139 out of 140.

This is a consequence of the country's unequal access to healthcare and deteriorating health care system.

### Glossy policies not improving rural women farmers

THE myriad of policies gathering dust on government file cabinets are just not making a difference in the lives of women farmers.

These sentiments were shared by women attending a Swaziland National Agricultural Union (SNAU) women forum held at Esibayeni Lodge yesterday. Most participants complained that the country has a lot of glossy policies, which are barely unpacked to the relevant people. Making her presentation, Lungile Mnisi from the Church Forum who represented CANGO in this forum noted that women make up a significant portion c. the agricultural labour force, constituting an average of 43 per cent in developing countries and 50 per cent in Sub-Saharan Africa.

CANGO is the Coordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations. Reacting to this presentation, one participant shot up to echo Mnisi's words.

"I believe Eswatini has a lot of policies in place, which rural women farmers are unfortunately unaware of. I also don't understand why women, or farmers in rural areas are not part of the policy-making policies in the first place and why these documents are always written in English," she said.

Complained

Other participants complained that women farmers are faced with a whole lot of challenges ranging from evictions by in-laws when their spouses die to lack of security in their farming areas. SNAU Executive Director Lwazi Mamba explained that the forum was aimed at sharing experiences and learning from successes of other women farmers and their failures in order to promote agribusinesses in the country. Mamba said SNAU was also exploring means of encouraging women farmers to be involved in leadership and decision-making positions in order to influence decisions and agriculture policies.

SHACK spaza shops which also sell food, fruits and snacks around the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) Kwaluseni Campus and IDM College continue to operate despite being shut down by the Matsapha Town Council two months ago.

A majority of these spaza shops were forced to close because of lack of proper sanitation, especially those selling grilled chicken, famously known as 'chicken dust'. The municipality said without proper accommodation and sanitation, there is no guarantee that the food served by these spaza shops is healthy.

Interviewed randomly, a majority of students from both IDM College and

UNESWA said they enjoyed the food being sold in these spaza shops.

"The food they sell to us is afford-

able and nice. You do not spend a lot of money yet you get a fulfilling meal," they said.

### 'Town council should provide accommodation'

ONE of the shack spaza owners \*Sicelo Msitsini who sells 'chicken dust' said the town council should support them as small business owners rather than forcing them to close.

He said it is the responsibility of the council to assist community members.

"I think it is their (town council's) responsibility to help us as small business owners to get proper accommodation close to the campuses. Even if we save enough to build a small structure, we are told by the town council that it is not the right place so we end

up erecting the shacks". Msitsini also highlighted that the eatery business is what they rely on to survive and take care of their families. He further mentioned that if they stop operating, their families would suffer as the eateries are their only source of income.

# Restaurant owners say shack spazas killing their businesses

ONE of the restaurants close to the IDM College and UNESWA Kwaluseni Campus complying with standards set by the town council, faces closure due to financial problems.

The restaurant owner \*Nomcebo Kunene said her business is failing because most of the students support the shack spaza shops. Kunene said this means that they would struggle to meet the demands of the council. "We struggle to pay rent and the salaries of those few employees we have because we have less customers. A majority of the students (target market) support the shack eateries, forcing us to reduce the price of our items.

This leads to little or no profit, sometimes we even struggle to pay rent," she said. One of the students from UNESWA said the reason they showed keen interest in the shacks over the proper restaurants is because the quantity of the food being served at the shacks is higher compared to that being served in properly housed eateries.

"We know that the food might be unhealthy but it is satisfying compared to that being served at the restaurants. For E20 at a restaurant, you get a small size plate while at the shacks you get a big full meal which can sometimes be shared," she said.

### The money I have I worked for - Madzonga

CAPE TOWN – Vele Investments' former chief executive, Robert Madzonga, said that he worked for the money he received from scandal-hit VBS Mutual Bank and Vele Investments.

Vele Investments is VBS Mutual Banks's largest shareholder.

Madzonga was speaking to 702's Bruce Whitfield, on his radio show 'The Money Show'.

To be clear, VBS Mutual Bank is one of the subsidiaries of Vele investments, according to Madzonga.

Vele first invested in VBS bank in 2017.

When asked whether it was always the intention to rob VBS Mutual Bank, Madzonga said that "no there has never been an intention to rob the bank, from Vele's point of view".

Whitfield wanted to know more about the 'Kingpin of this Catastrophe' as he put it, the founder and Chairperson of Vele Investments, Tshifhiwa Matodzi. Madzonga said he could only comment on the forensic report by Advocate
Terry Motau.

There was some damning evidence in the report on Matodzi but Madzonga was clear that he would wait for Matodzi to comment.

Whitfield asked Madzonga then about the R30 million benefit he received from VBS bank, as stated in the report.

Madzonga said he had always cooperated with authorities and with investigators.

He said he worked for both Vele and VBS and worked hard for that money. He was, in fact, the acting chief operating officer (COO) of VBS bank but was removed for not having the 'right

credentials'.

The report further said that Madzonga still, however, received a salary in September and October.

Madzonga said that he was not at the bank when the irregularities happened and in fact, the COO at the time should have seen what was happening.

# Dis-Chem HY profit up as market share increases

JOHANNESBURG - South African pharmacy group Dis-Chem's halfyear profit on a per share basis rose 10.5 per cent as it lifted its market share across all divisions.

The drugstore chain said diluted headline earnings per share (HEPS) was 51.7 cents, compared with 46.8 cents per share for the six-month period ended August 2017.

Headline EPS is the most widely watched profit measure in South Africa which strips out certain one-off items. Dis-Chem said the one per cent VAT increase in April along with the fuel price increases had dampened trading in April and July.

"Subsequently, we have seen trading improvements in August and then again in September, suggesting consumer confidence is improving slightly," Chief Executive Ivan Saltzman said in a statement.

Group turnover grew by 9.4 per cent to R10.5 billion from R9.6 bil-

lion. Dis-Chem declared a gross dividend of 20.69 cents per share.

In July, Dis-Chem Pharmacies said sales rose by 11 per cent in the first four months of the financial year.

The growth was boosted from its beauty, healthcare and other front-of-shop products.

The company, which listed on the stock exchange in 2016, said group sales rose to R7 billion in the four months through June 30 compared with the same period a year earlier.

Retail sales increased 11.1 per cent to R 6.4bn from R5.7bn in the prior period, despite consumers tightening their belts after an increases in value-added tax (VAT) and fuel prices. "The continuing increase in the fuel price along with the one per cent increase in the VAT rate continues to put pressure on consumers which was evident in our April and May retail sales," Saltzman said in a statement. Reuters

### SA's growth outlook cut by Moody's

JOHANNESBURG - Moody's on Tuesday revised the country's growth forecast down to 0.5 per cent this year, but maintained that South Africa could see an upgrade if the government implemented structural reforms to resuscitate the economy and curbed public debt.

Moody's said the elevated government debt and liability risk from stateowned enterprises (SOEs) remained a risk to the country's growth prospects. It said the reduction of contingency liability reforms would exert upward pressure on the country's overall rating, resulting in a downgrade.

The news saw credit spread in the market, moving up 18 basis points on Tuesday from a non-attractive 236 basis points to 217. Economist Brian Kantor said the outlook put more pressure on Finance Minister Tito Mboweni's medium-term Budget policy statement (MTBPS) next Wednesday.

"We will wait and see," said Kantor.
"Moody's is particularly sympathetic to South Africa - more than other agencies." The appraisal came just hours after Eskom, the country's biggest liability, confirmed another dim forecast for the current financial year, saying it was poised to record losses of R45 billion. Moody's said while Mboweni's replacement of former minister Nhlanhla Nene a few weeks before the mini-Budget was received as positive, it still



expects the country's policy direction to remain the same, given the lack of

changes in the past few years.

# 'PEACE MINISTRY' TO TACKLE VIOLENCE IN SWEEPING RESHUFFLE

ETHOPIA- Ethiopia's prime minister created a new Ministry of Peace and handed half the posts in his cabinet to women in a sweeping cabinet reshuffle on Tuesday as he sought to tackle a wave of ethnic violence.

Abiy Ahmed - who has turned the region's politics on its head with a string of reforms since being appointed in April - named new finance and defence ministers in an overhaul that left only four of the appointments unchanged.

"The main problem in this country is the lack of peace. This (peace) ministry will be working hard to ensure it prevails," Abiy told law-makers. About 2.2 million people out of a population of 100 million have been displaced by violence since last year, much of it between rival ethnic groups. The new peace ministry will be led by former parliament speaker Muferiat Kamil, and her office will oversee the intelli-

gence and security agencies, the government said. Since his appointment, Abiy has made peace with neighbour Eritrea and presided over the partial privatisation of key economic sectors such as telecommunications. The 42-year-old has also extended an olive branch to several rebel groups, promised to follow a policy of reconciliation and rein in the powerful security agencies. Yet the changes have not stopped ethnically-charged

violence, some of which escalatedsince he was named premier.

Former construction minister Aisha Mohammed was named defence minister - the first woman to hold that position in the country. *Reuters*

Criminal gangs had been operating in a 'sanctuary' of dense forest between the Maradi area of southern Niger and the Nigerian border, Bazoum Mohamed said. A three-week operation by the two armies meant authorities were now 'fully in control' of the region.'

Bom in a poor neighborhood of Angola's capital Luanda, the 10-month old boy has microcephaly, a birth defect marked by a small head and serious developmental problems. He still can't sit upright and has difficulty seeing and hearing. *Reuters* 



### 12 killed in fresh Mali violence

MALI - Eleven people were shot dead in restive central Mali on Monday by unidentified gunmen, while a blast killed one person and injured two, sources said. The gun attack took place in the village of Telly, a few dozen kilometres (miles) from the town of Tenenkou, a local official said."They killed 11 civilians. Some of them came by motor bike," the source said. A Malian security source confirmed the attack in Telly and the death toll, and said 'criminals' were to blame.

### Struggle to stop a runaway luggage

WINDHOEK - Namibian airport workers had a hard time trying to stop a runaway luggage train that was being blown across the tarmac on Sunday, The Namibian reports."... Strong winds at the Hosea Kutako International Airport triggered a spectacle in which four officials chased after a train of four runaway luggage trolleys which were heading towards a stationary plane at full speed," the report said.

# 200 000 Congolese expelled as UN warns of 'humanitarian crisis'

GOMA - Some 200 000 Congolese migrants have been expelled from Angola and returned home to the troubled Kasai province - an influx that could result in a humanitarian crisis.

The UN refugee agency UNHCR "is appealing to the governments of Angola and the DRC to work together to ensure a safe and orderly population movement," the body said in a statement on Tuesday.

The mass expulsions started about two weeks ago, when the Angolan government ordered the migrants - who were working in the informal mining sector in the north-east of the country - to go back to neighbouring Congo, the UNHCR said. There have been reports of violent clashes in some parts of Angola as police tried to enforce the order, as well as reports of sexual violence and theft at border points, the body said.

"The Congolese are returning to a desperate situation, looking for safety and aid. With more arriving every day, thousands are reported to be stuck at and near the border," the statement said.

"In addition, many are likely to face difficulties due to destruction caused by recent conflict in the area," it added.

Congolese government spokesman Lambert Mende told dpa Tuesday that a team has been deployed to help those Congolese who have arrived home. Mende said the government was also investigating "extremely serious allegations" that some of their nationals were violently expelled.

# Case of slain Libyan rebel commander opens old wounds

LIBYA - Eastern Libyan authorities have resumed an investigation into the unexplained killing of a top rebel commander in the 2011 uprising that toppled Muammar Gaddafi, a case that could reopen old wounds.

The unsolved killing of Abdel Fattah Younes by suspected fellow fighters in 2011 caused deep rifts inside the rebel camp of the kind that have marked the turmoil and

violence gripping Libya ever since.

The investigation risks stirring new tensions between eastern Libya, controlled by the forces of General Khalifa Haftar, and a U.N.-backed administration in the eapital Tripoli.

Haftar ordered the eastern military prosecutor to 'immediately and urgently reopen the investigation' of the killing of Younes and two others slain in 2011, according to a decree posted late on Monday.

A previous investigation launched in 2011 had named as prime suspect Ali Essawi, who was deputy prime minister during the uprising at a rebel transitional authority which took over power from Gaddafi. A court later dropped the case against Essawi and other suspects. But Essawi resurfaced into the spotlight when Tripoli-based Prime Minister Fayez appointed him as economy minister this month. *Reuters*

### Zimbabwe probes post-election violence that killed six

HARARE -A public inquiry into the deaths of six people after Zimbabwe's landmark elections started hearing oral testimonies on Tuesday with witnesses pointing fingers at the opposition, which has already labelled the probe 'preemptive'.

President Emmerson Mnangagwa appointed the seven-member commission of inquiry, led by former South African president Kgalema Motlanthe, after at least six people died when the army opened fire on post-poll protests in August.

Anti-fraud protesters had taken to the streets of Zimbabwe's capital Harare accusing the country's electoral commission of delaying the announcement of results for general elections held on July 30.

"We have urged all the eyewitnesses and all those who have information that may assist the work of

the commission, to please come forward," Motlanthe said at the start of the public hearings at a hotel in the capital. Motlanthe said the com-

cumstances which necessitated the involvement of the military in assisting in the maintenance of law and order". It will also "consider whether the degree of force used was appropriate to ensuring the threat to public safety law and order among other things," he added. In recent days the commission has been accepting written submissions. In her oral testimony, witness Patricia Ruzawi, blamed opposition Movement for Democratic Change (MDC) supporters for the violence. "They were saying 'down with Mnangagwa' and (that) they were tired of elections being rigged. And they were saying this will not happen again," Ružawi said. Nyasha Zenda, a ruling Zanu-PF member and election candidate said he was assaulted by MDC supporters who later burned his campaign bus. AFP



# SNAKE PASTOR' FEEDS DOG MEAT TO CONGREGANTS FOR COMMUNION



Controversial 'snake pastor' Penuel Minguni who has fed snake and rat to his congregants, has now chosen dog meat for communion.

In a video posted on the self-proclaimed prophet's End Times Disciples Ministries Facebook page on Sunday, Mnguni can be seen feeding dog meat to his followers.

In a separate post, which displays pictures of the dog before, during and after it was slaughtered, he says "it is not what goes through the mouth that disqualifies us and defile us but what comes out of the mouth — The heart matters most than what decomposes (Food we eat) (sic)".

"Christianity has shifted so much from time to time, however, at End Times Disciples Ministries, the move of God has been seen as many peoples faiths has also been challenged. From changing a snake to chocolate – to partaking octopus and frogs – a dog stew was

prepared for the church to partake as Holy Communion (sic)."

The post further said that Jesus never limited people to biscuits and juice, but commanded "that as often as we remember we partake his body and blood".

In the video, Mnguni can be heard saying that congregants are eating the body of Christ.

"It is no longer a dog, it is the flesh of our Lord Jesus Christ," Mnguni said. "I prayed for these bones, this is no longer a dog. "... anyone who is against this, is against the Lord." Mnguni also eats the meat himself, telling his followers that "people will say the man of God is not eating the dog".

"This is so nice," he says after taking a bite.

Later in the video, he also infers that HIV and cancer can be cured through prayer.

"Those who have sicknesses, HIV, overdue pregnancies, I pray. Here's the cross confronting your situation. "Those who have cancer spirit, here's the cross anointing that cancer." The pastor from Soshanguve in Tshwane has previously had his congregants eat snakes, hair and cockroaches. In 2016, Mnguni made headlines after images of him driving over his congregants were posted on social media. His End Times Disciples Ministries showed pictures of him behind the wheel of a car, driving over two people outside the Kameelrivier B Stadium hall on June 3. News24

### 'If Floyd stole money from poor, I will face him'

JOHANNESBURG - The Economic Freedom Fighters (EFF) has thrown its weight behind its Deputy President Floyd Shivambu, whose brother, Brian, allegedly received R16 million from the collapsed VBS Mutual Bank.

"The deputy president has taken the EFF leadership into his confidence and we have no reason to not believe him.

We note that several persons mentioned in the [VBS] report are challenging it, any pronouncement on the validity of the report is premature," party leader Julius Malema told reporters in Johannesburg.

Neither Shivambu nor the EFF was mentioned in the report, he added.

Media reports alleged that R10 million of the R16 million VBS cash was directed to Brian's brother Floyd, while the EFF benefited to the tune of R1.3 million. The brothers have separately denied receiving cash emanating from the bank.

When asked why the EFF was taking its deputy president's word and not investigating him, Malema said there was no basis to investigate. "Investigation based on what?...give us something [to work with].

In the absence of prima facie evidence, there cannot be such. And I am not afraid of Floyd...if Floyd stole money from the poor, I will face him." *African News Agency* 

### 'No evidence that PIC's Dan Matjila had a relationship with Pretty Louw'

CAPE TOWN - A source close to the forensic investigation into Public Investment Corporation (PIC) boss Dan Matjila says the probe found no evidence that there was a relationship between him and the owner of Maison Holdings (MST), Pretty Louw.

"There is no evidence that Matjila and Ms Louw have or had a romantic relationship," he said.

Matjila has publicly denied allegations that he and Louw have a romantic relationship. Louw also denied allegations that she received money from or had a romantic relationship with Matjila.

When questioned by MPs about the allegations, Matjila stuck to his guns and was cautioned that he could face prosecution if he was found to be lying to Parliament.

According to my information, all of the documents submitted by the CEO and CFO as evidence of the loan to MST were valid; the loan of R21m was provided to MST and not Maison Holdings; the allocation of R5m to MST as Corporate Social Investment was in a with the PIC's CSI strategy which had been approved by the board in November 2016."

# Man butchers sister, cuts off penis of little nephew

JOHANNESBURG - On Monday morning, Nokulunga Pita returned to her home in Umthambeka Section, Tembisa, after a frantic phone call from her son saying something bad had happened.

Pita, 46, had been sleeping at a sick fellow church member's house in the same section of the East Rand township since Friday. "I opened the door and found my son sitting on a small chair next to my daughter's body. My daughter was lying in a pool of blood and her baby laid next to her. "There was blood everywhere. I took the child and put him on my back because I thought he had fainted. My son told me he had killed his sister and nephew," Pita said. Pita said her daughter Fundiswa's throat had been slit, her index finger severed while one of her eyes had been removed. She said she did not see any injuries on her grandson Sisipho until

police told her his private parts were missing. Pita said her son told her he killed his sister because she had stolen R20 from him. "I asked him why he did this to his sister and he lied about her taking his money." Pita said her 25-year-old son had a drug problem and behaved strangely when high. "He is a good person but behaves strangely after smoking dagga. He would act wild, and be angry about everything.

"He had stopped smoking some time ago but I smelled dagga on him recently. "I asked him if he was smoking again but he did not respond," she said.

Pita could not stop crying throughout the interview. Her tears dried up for a few minutes when she spoke about Fundiswa, 28, who was a final-year Business Administration student at Sakhisizwe College in Orange Grove, Johannesburg.

# JUDGE THROWS OUT DANIELS' LAWSUIT AGAINST TRU

WASHINGTON - A federal judge on Monday dismissed a lawsuit from adult film actress Stormy Daniels that claimed President Donald Trump defamed her when he suggested she had lied about being threatened to keep quiet about their alleged relationship.

US District Judge James Otero in Los Angeles ruled that Trump's speech was protected by the First Amendment as the kind of "rhetorical hyperbole' normally associated with politics and public discourse in the United States." He ordered Daniels, whose given name is Stephanie Clifford, to pay Trump's legal fees. Trump's attorney Charles Harder cheered Otero's decision.

"No amount of spin or commentary by Stormy Daniels or her lawyer, Mr. Avenatti, can truthfully characterise today's ruling in any way other than total victory for President Trump and total defeat for Stormy Daniels," Harder said in an emailed statement.

The ruling is a blow for Daniels and

fees Trump might be awarded from the defamation case would "be dwarfed by the fees he and Cohen will be required to pay in connection with the NDA case." Later, Avenatti tweeted that he had appealed Otero's ruling to the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals.

The now-dismissed suit has received less attention than two other cases pending against Trump-Daniels' lawsuit seeking to void the non-disclosure agreement and a separate defamation claim by former Apprentice contestant Summer Zervos, who alleges that Trump sexually assaulted her in 2007 and argues that he defamed her when he suggested she was lying. Trump was ordered last month to provide written answers under oath in that case, which is proceeding in New York State Supreme Court. Avenatti and Daniels have joined the ranks of Trump's chief antagonists since the beginning of this year, when Daniels' non-disclosure agreement was first reported. The Washington Post

VIETNAM -Vietnam police discovered a massive haul of suspected methamphetamine worth an estimated \$3m after pulling over a speeding truck, authorities said on Tuesday, the latest major bust in a country where synthetic drug use is on the rise. Two men managed to escape the scene but one of them who was arrested later, a Laotian, said he was promised \$10 000 to deliver the drugs to Danang city, a tourist hub on Vietnam's central coast. ### Two pilots killed in jet crash

UKRAINE - Ukraine's general staff said on Tuesday that two pilots died when a Sukhoi fighter jet crashed during military exercises with the United States and other NATO countries. "A Sukhoi-27 plane crashed at around 17:00 local time (1400 GMT) during a training flight," the general staff said on its Facebook page, adding that "the bodies of the two pilots have been found". The circumstances of the crash are being investigated, the statement said. AP

### Baby choked to death in bed

LONDON - A boy of seven months choked to death in a bed that was built with 'no thought or care' for the safety of the child sleeping in it, a court heard. Oscar Abbey was found by his father 'unconscious and not breathing' when he went to check on the baby at 6am before he left for work. He had wriggled his body backwards through a square hole in the bed's side, but his head was too big to fit through and he became jammed at the neck with fatal consequences, Leeds Crown Court was told. ### Trump wants 'cutting edge' deal with UK to start immediately

WASHINGTON - The Trump administration has announced it wants to start formal trade walks with the UK immediately after Brexit.

The US Trade Representative's office wrote to Congress on Tuesday to say it plans to start negotiations 'as soon as it is ready' after Brexit Day on March 29, in news that will provide a welcome boost to Theresa May.

The department will also start working on a deal with the European Union and Japan, it revealed in two other letters.

President Trump has long said he wants a trade pact with Britain, and hailed Brexit as a "wonderful opportunity" for a "big and ambitious" UK-USA agreement in a joint statement with May in New York. The message from Robert Lighhizer, US trade representative, to Orrin Hatch, the Chairman of the Senate finance committee, came in a letter on Tuesday as the UK continues with lastditch negotiations with Brussels.

"The United States and the United Kingdom are the first and fifth largest economies in the world, respectively, and maintain a broad and deep trade and investment relationship," Lighhizer said.

"An ambitious trade agreement between our two countries could further expand this relationship by removing existing goods and services tariff and non-tariff barriers and by developing cutting edge opportunities for emerging sectors where US and UK innovators and entrepreneurs are most competitive." ### Canada becomes second country to legalise marijuana for recreational use

CANADA - Nearly a century of marijuana prohibition came to an end yesterday as Canada became the first major Western nation to legalise and regulate its sale and recreational

The change was praised by pot enthusiasts and investors in a budding industry that has seen pot stocks soar on the Toronto and New York stock exchanges, but sharply questioned by some health professionals and opposition politicians.

"We're not legalising cannabis because we think it's good election in 2019, as well as for our health. We're doing other nations that the prime

it because we know it's not good for our children," Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said on the eve of the reform.

"We know we need to do a better job to protect our children and to eliminate or massively reduce the profits that go to organised crime.'

The Cannabis Act, which fulfils a promise Trudeau made in the 2015 election campaign, makes Canada only the second nation after Uruguay to legalise the drug.

Its implementation will be scrutinised and dissected by Canadians ahead of the next

### New York marks first shooting-free weekend in 25 yrs

**NEW YORK - New York has** marked its first weekend without a shooting in 25 years, police said on Monday.

"We went Friday, Saturday, Sunday without any shootings and homicides," New York Police Department chief James O'Neill told reporters.

"That's the first time in decades,

and that's something not just the NYPD, but all New Yorkers can be proud of." The last time the most populous US city of 8.5 million had a weekend without shootings was in 1993, according to police. But there have been intermittent spikes. The weekend of October 6-7, for example, was "terrible," with several shootings in

Brooklyn and the Bronx, authorities said. The number of murders is on the rise again this year, after hitting a low in 2017 with 292 total - a record since the 1950s. In the first half of 2018, the city recorded 147 murders, an eight per cent increase over the same period in 2017, and mostly in Brooklyn and the Bronx. AFP










# ENCAC, ACASWA HEA AT LOGGERHE

Mzwakhe calls it madness Mzwakhe needs psychological evaluation - ENCAC CEO

ENCAC and ACASWA heads are in cold war, not mincing words about their honest feelings towards either's way of leadership.

Following the drama that has been unfolding between Eswatini National Council of Arts and Culture CEO Stanley Dlamini and Association of Christian Artists in Swaziland (ACASWA) President Mzwakhe Myeni, Myeni still refuses to go by the ENCAC's rule book.

Myeni said ENCAC has no right to call a 'special meeting' for ACASWA as the association does not report to the council as far as he is concerned.

This follows ACASWA being summoned by ENCAC.

"Ngumsangano lo (It's madness). We are not under arts and culture. We are just an independent association. We are not supervised by arts and culture for that matter. Usangene Stanley (Stanley is crazv)

"We work with ENCAC in some projects but not as a mother body of association. We really don't have to report to them. I'm shocked that he (Stanley Dlamini) does not even respect a court order. Ulibele vele, kukhombisa kungafundzi loku (loose-

ly translated; He is dull, this shows that he is not educated)," said the furious president when asked about the ACASWA 'special meeting' that has been postponed to a date that is yet to be announced.

The special meeting by ENCAC was basically about forming an interim committee that will draft a constitution and prepare for ACASWA elections as they dissolved the association two months ago. Myeni said he was not aware of any meeting with ENCAC as they are an independant association and they do not want anything to do with ENCAC to a point where they have taken the council to court to stop them from interfering in ACASWA

"First of all, Stanley's contract at the council elapsed long time ago. He cannot be a CEO for 20 years now. We are still waiting for the new minister to help us remove Stanley from that seat. He is clearly getting too comfortable. All associations are not happy with him occupying that chair. He does things as he pleases," Myeni said.

Worth noting is that the ENCAC CEO Stanley Dlamini's contract was renewed last year as announced by the ENCAC Chairperson Busisiwe Simelane, who even mentioned that the ministry and the board were happy with Dlamini's work.

### MTN SWAMA awards amass 15 705 votes

WITH a little over two weeks left before deadline, a total of 15 705 votes have been recorded in the MTN SWAMA awards.

This is an improvement of 2 468 from the previous tally's 13 237 votes. This was revealed by the Eswatini Arts and Music Association (SWAMA) PRO Thabile Mdluli.

The Song of the Year category, which is the only 100 per cent reliant on public votes, experienced a surge and made it to the top five; displacing Best Comedian; which now rests at mumber six from number five previously. Also experiencing a minor setback was the DJ of the Year category; from number three to number five. Meanwhile, the Best Female Artist of the Year and Artist of the

Year categories both showed a huge improvement as they moved at five and four places, respectively.

"Disappointingly, there has been very little activity in the bottom five categories. These are Best Jazz Artist/Group, Best Male Artist, Best Video, Best Afro-Pop Artist/Group and Best Swati Artist based in the Diaspora. This is despite the extension of the voting deadline from 30th September to 31st October, 2018 to accommodate the least performing categories," she added.

Meanwhile, despite fans and followers casting over 15 000 votes since voting was officially opened in July, there are still a few who are voting wrongly. As a result, nearly 100 votes have been spoiled. Mdluli said these votes would be regarded invalid when the adjudication process takes place.

### Invalid votes:

- There is no mention of either the name of the artist being voted for or the category.
- Voters write their names and not the names of the artists they are voting for.
- Artists are allocated the wrong categories.
- · Voters vote for a group of artists in one SMS.
- Voters write 'SWAMA 6161' instead of the name of the artist followed by the category.

"The proper way to vote is to SMS Category, Name of Artist to 6161 (e.g. Best Duo/Group, Dynamic Trio). SMS costs only E1.

### 'Mzwakhe needs psychological evaluation

MEANWHILE, ENCAC CEO Stanley Dlamini simply just brushed off Mzwakhe's statement and said the president really needs psychological evaluation.

"I am sure this is a joke. He must refer to previous presidents.

This is a sign of brain failure," Dlamini simply said.

Dlamini was not even touched by Myeni's statement as he considered him as a madcap. According to ENCAC's website, the Council's controlling officer is the chief executive officer, aided by the support

staff and the executive board's sub-committees, namely: personnel, development and finance committees. The chief executive officer reports to the executive board, which in turn is under the ministry of sports culture and youth affairs through the office of the director of culture.

The members of the Council are: the Association of Swaziland Theatre Groups (ASTG), Association of Christian Artists in Swaziland (ACASWA), Eswatini Arts and Music Association (SWAMA), Independent Producers Association (IPAS), Imigidvo Yesintfu KaNgwane, Swaziland

National Umbholoho Association (SNUA) Swaziland Traditional Instruments Players Music Association (STIMA), Swaziland Schools Culture Association (SSCA). Eswatini Pageants, Swaziland Visual Arts Network (VANS) and Umdlandla Writers and Authors Association, to mention only a few. Meanwhile, ACASWA has called all artists for an AGM scheduled for Sunday in Manzini at Caritas, starting at 2: 30 pm.

"All I can say right now is that our AGM is on Sunday, and all our subscribing Christian artists will be there," Myeni con-

# EEDS MESUT OZIL

MUNICH - Mesut Ozil must end his international retirement and return to play for Germany - for the good of himself, his country and Arsenal.

That is the view of Arsene Wenger, Ozil's former manager at the Emirates Stadium, who says his one-time favourite pupil cannot be at his best again unless he resumes playing international football.

Ozil, who turned 30 on Monday, quit Germany after the furore over his meeting with controversial Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan was compounded by a humiliating World Cup for the team, for which the midfielder became a scapegoat.

### Retirement

The fallout from Ozil's retirement has been bitter but Wenger, who left Arsenal after 22 years in charge in May, said that it is in both sides' interests to rebuild bridges. Germany's miserable form has continued without Ozil - defeats by Holland and France in the last week mean Joachim Low's fallen giants have now lost six of their last 10 games and face relegation in the Nations League.

"I believe that Germany needs Ozil," Wenger told Bild. "I hope that Low can convince him that he will come back. Ozil is a super football player and was not the

worst in the World Cup.

"I 'id not like that he left the team. A little bit of motivation disappears when you know that you do not have to be ready for the World Cup and European Championship.

"I love it when the player is as good as possible. If he does not play on an international level, a bit is lost."

Wenger, meanwhile, gave a clear hint

that he will be in a new job in 2019 - and that he could already have one lined up. Paris Saint-Germain are known to want him as their director of football but the 68-yearold Frenchman suggested he could become an international manager, or even return to Japan, where he was in charge of Nagoya Grampus Eight before moving to Arsenal in 1996. again."


He added: "There are associations, national teams; it could also be in Japan," Wenger said.


Germany travelled to the Stade de France looking for the win that would salvage their Nations League campaign, and some pride, following their disastrous World Cup.

Les Bleus captain Lloris was one of several players who admitted the hosts had desperately needed to raise their game against a rejuvenated Germany side that showed plenty of promise.

"When we lift our level, the play-

"We had to stay alert at the back... stay calm and composed so as not to concede the second goal."

Following a scoreless draw against Germany in Munich, a 2-1 win over the Netherlands and a tense 2-2 draw with Iceland, France sit top of Group 1.

Germany are bottom on one point after failing to register a win in the competition so far following their draw with France and a humbling 3-0 defeat to the Netherlands at the weekend. Despite an average age of 25, France are showing maturity beyond their years-a tendency vice-captain Raphael Varane believes was crucial to their World Cup suc-

cess. "We managed to win the World Cup thanks to our mental qualities, despite some difficult moments," said Varane. Although he is only 25, the central defender has already won four Champions League titles with Real Madrid. He added: "We have to keep these values, and not allow panic to set in. We have confidence in ourselves, and we know what we're capable of." *AFP* 

# Arsenal loanee finding his feet at Hoffenheim

LONDON - Arsenal winger Reiss Nelson says he is starting to enjoy himself at Hoffenheim after a slow start at the Bundesliga club.

"The Sihlangu coach failed to impress with the national squad. We were not expecting miracles but I was not entirely happy with the squad selection for camp as well as those that eventually featured in the games," said Nqobile Ndlangamandla.

### Professionalism

Another supporter Themba Mamba said this was a result of non-professionalism in the Eswatini Football Association (EFA).

"The problem here is with our association. It gives out jobs not by merit but to their friends. The coach has not achieved much at team level and with the women squad but he has been given the senior national team job.

"He has been busy with the senior squad and will have less than a month to prepare the U-23 and we expect miracles," he said.

go back to the drawing board and see the areas we can improve on," he said.


Meanwhile, Consul of Egypt to Mozambique and the Kingdom of Eswatini Sayed Okail said he enjoyed
