



'Stop lidlokolo construction'

CIVIL servants are not buying the excuse that government is broke yet she is building a mansion for ex-Prime Minister Sibusiso Barnabas Dlamini.

During the protest in Mbabane yesterday, TUCOSWA's Deputy Secretary General Muzi Mhlanga said for the past three years, government had failed to increase salaries for civil servants and wondered where the budget allocated for the ex-PM's lidlokolo came from.

"Why should there be money for other projects but nothing for the civil servants? If anything, lidlokolo construction should be stopped and the money be channelled to the civil servant's cost of living adjustment," he said. Mhlanga also disputed claims made by government that they had reached an agreement on some of the listed issues, stating that they did engage in talks but there was no legal document stipulating agreements. The marchers will convene again this morning and they will be heading down to Manzini to continue with the strike which will end tomorrow with all the branches coming to the capital city.

While the situation was controllable in the other towns, complete

pandemonium was the order of the day in Manzini during the first day of the planned three-day protest.

At least seven protesters were seriously injured when police clashed with striking TUCOSWA members while three were arrested when all hell broke loose at the hub during the course of the protest.

According to SNAT leaders, three of their members were arrested. However, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati claimed that only three cases of malicious injury to property were reported but no arrests made.

SNAT, NAPSAWU call off strike

Stories by Sandile Nkambule Industrial Court

THE Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) and the National Association of Public Servants and Allied Workers Union (NAPSAWU) have called off their planned strike

This follows a consent order that was issued by the Industrial Court yesterday afternoon by Judge Nkosinathi Nkonyane.

"By consent of all the parties, no strike action shall take place on September 19, 2018, respondents (SNAT, NAPSAWU) however reserve the right to pursue any strike action further at a later date within the confines of the law," Judge Nkonyane ordered. The order was issued after government had brought the matter to court under a certificate of urgency, seeking an order to interdict the unions and its members from engaging in the industrial action that had been billed for today and tomorrow.

The Attorney General Sifiso Khumalo, representing government, told the court he wanted to share good news which he had received from his learned friends Sipho Madzinane and Sipho Mtshali for SNAT and NAPSAWU to the effect that the strike action is not on today.

The attorney general was alongside Principal Crown Counsel Ndabenhle Dlamini while Madzinane and Mtshali represented the unions.

"My Lord, we have by consent reached an agreement that a consent order be made an order of this court to the effect that the strike action shall not take place tomorrow (today) and that the respondents reserve the right to pursue any strike action in further dates within the confines of the law," the attorney general submitted.

Lawyers Madzinane and Mtshali confirmed the consent order before it was endorsed by Judge Nkonyane as an order of court.

The Government of Eswatini yesterday morning filed an urgent application seeking an order interdicting and restraining the unions and all civil servants who are not members of the unions who may align themselves with the strike action, from embarking upon the strike action.

Further, government was seeking a declaratory order that the unions' notices of intention to go on strike do not comply with the provisions of Section 86(2) of the Industrial Relations Act of 2000 and also declaring that the intended strike action is unlawful with regard to Section 86(8) of

However, the matter was not argued any further yesterday in as far as the prayers sought by government were concerned as the parties reached a consensus with the consent order made an order of court.

'There will be no govt if elections sabotaged by strike'

ACTING Prime Minister Dr Vincent Mhlanga says sabotaging, disrupting the national elections through a strike action by public servants would certainly result in there being no constitutionally established government of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

The polling, presiding and returning officers together with drivers in the elections process, have been drawn from different government ministries according to Mhlanga and such may certainly disrupt the elections.

This is contained in an affidavit that was yesterday deposed of by the acting prime minister in the urgent application for an interdict of the intended strike action by SNAT and NAP-

According to the acting head of govow that the strike has been noted by the unions, it has been carefully and thoroughly considered by the applicant (government) and found to be against the national interest in so far as its timing considering the fact that it coincides with the current national elections.

Mhlanga submitted that all transport used at the elections is fuelled at the Central Transport Administration (CTA), which is manned by the civil servants, whose bargaining agent is NAPSAWU.

"Disruption, failure or sabotaging of the elections by the public servants on strike would certainly result in

there being no constitutionally established Government of Eswatini. There is, therefore, an urgent need to divest the industrial action from political manoeuvres," Mhlanga submitted. Overstretched

He stated in his affidavit that mass industrial action always requires police presence to protect life, limb and property and besides, the general maintenance of public order, unfortunately, the national police service is overstretched in meeting the demands of

the electoral process itself.

He stated that the electoral business extends beyond polling itself as there are also campaigns, polling and possible reruns ordered by the High Court.

The strike, according to Mhlanga, would adversely affect the elections and political life of the country as demonstrated in his above submissions, yet the industrial action is for purposes unconnected with the politics of the country.

The disruption of the elections, once occurred according to Mhlanga, would be irreversible and at huge financial loss to government, a hearing in due course would, therefore, be unhelpful as damage shall have been done with permanence.

Affected

Mhlanga mentioned in his papers that the strike notices by the unions do not comply with the requirements of Section 86(2) of the Industrial Relations Act in so far as the involved employees and affected departments have not been specified so as to enable the employer to make necessary adjustments to her business operations during the strike. According to Mhlanga, there is no other way to stop the strike action with its intended devastating effect on the general business of government, the country's economy and its free and fair parliamentary elections, flagging the fact that the interdict was the only available remedy-

For the remainder of the day, the workers marched around town while chanting political slogans.

Another head teacher who identified herself as Futhi Dlamini said as workers they would only go back to work once they had received a 6.5 per cent CoLA. Swaziland National Association

of Teachers (SNAT) outgoing

President Freedom Dlamini, when addressing the members of TUCOSWA, thanked everyone for coming out to support the protest action.

He said such unity was good because 'united workers stand but divided they fall'. Dlamini said it was time for every worker to stand up and fight for what is rightfully his or hers. Dlamini was interrupted while in the middle of his speech as workers soon burst into song and protested as more and more protesters made their way into the arena. In Nhlangano, TUCOSWA Secretary General Mduduzi Gina addressed workers before they could disperse and informed them not to report to work today. He assured the protesters that the strike was lawful and, therefore, they should not have any fears about anything.

"All workers are expected to come and join us as this is a lawful protest action. Tomorrow (today), TUCOSWA will hear from you on what next should be done. You are going to give us direction." he said.

Confusion in schools after 'Vula Vala' statements

THERE was total confusion in schools yesterday after government closed and opened schools in a matter of hours apart.

Some schools were not operational owing to the confusion that emanated from two statements that were issued by Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Education Sibongile Dr Mtshali-Dlamini and acting Prime Minister Dr Vincent Mhlanga.

The PS announced the closure of all public schools owing to the TUCOSWA strike that launched itself yesterday. She said the closure was motivated by the desire to ensure safety of pupils during the strike that involved teachers. However, at midnight, Mhlanga overturned the earlier decision and ordered teachers to report for work and pupils back to class.

However, it was a little too late as parents had taken the closure announcement. As a result, some did not send their children to school. Teachers also joined the strike action staged in all the towns. A handful of pupils were seen loitering around town

In essence, schools were closed. The schools that were visited included St Mark's High and Primary, John Wesley Primary, Elangeni High, MDS

Primary and High. The pupils who were found roam-



had sent them back home due to the absence of teachers. Private schools were also affected by the ongoing strike by TUCOSWA. Pupils at Bahá'í Primary, Evangelical Pre-school and Primary as well as and Annadale schools were turned back by their principals.

"The principal came and told us to go back home since there were no teachers at the school," alleged a pupil from John Wesley Primary School.

Swaziland Principals Association (SWAPA) President Welcome Mhlanga refuted claims that they defied the government's order to open schools

ing around the school premises told yesterday. He said they were forced this publication that their principals by the situation since some pupils were absent due to the conflicting statements issued.

"The two statements might have confused the pupils," he said, further stating that schools would be operating today. "As principals, we cannot defy the government order to open schools," he said. However, Mhlanga mentioned that if yesterday's situation prevails, principals would have to again turn back the pupils.

On the other hand, Mtshali-Dlamini said she would not comment on the matter. "The matter is now handled by the acting prime minister, thus I will not comment," she said.

LANDMARK VICTORY: SA COURT LEGALISES DAGGA

JOHANNESBURG - The Constitutional Court has ruled that the personal use of dagga is not a criminal offence.

"The right to privacy is not confined to a home or private dwelling. It will not be a criminal offence for an adult person to use or be in possession of cannabis in private space," Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo said yesterday.

The judgment does not specify how many grammes of cannabis can a person use or have in private.

The ruling follows a Western Cape High Court judgment that the possession, cultivation and use of dagga for private use was allowed.

The state appealed that judgment in the Constitutional Court, arguing that the decision was not in line with the values of South Africans.

Key laws debated in the Western Cape High Court in 2017 were the Drugs Act Sections 4 (b) and 5 (b) as well as Section 22A of the Medicines Act.

The court ultimately found: "This Court must invoke its powers under Section 172 (1) (b) of the Constitution to order a suspension of the declaration of invalidity for a realistic period to ensure Parliament may correct the defect. In my view, a period of 24 months from the date of this judgment would be appropriate.

"The order also makes clear that the relevant provisions are only unconstitutional to the extent that they trench upon the private use and consumption of a quantity of cannabis for personal purposes, which the legislative considers does not constitute undue harm."

undue harm."

The Western Cape High Court also ordered that, in the interim period, prosecutions for personal dagga possession as described in its judgment should be stayed. Zondo ruled yesterday that Sections 4(b) and 5(b) of the Drugs Act, and Section 22A(9)(a)(i) of the Medicines Act were unconstitutional and

invalid, to the extent that it prohibits the use of possession of cannabis by an adult in private for the adult's personal consumption in private.

Zondo said the Constitutional Court held these statutory provisions to be constitutionally invalid, to the extent indicated, because they infringed the right to privacy entrenched in Section 14 of the Constitution.

The Constitutional Court dispensed with the High Court's limitation of its order to the use, cultivation or possession of cannabis at home or in private dwelling. It held that the right to privacy extends

beyond the boundaries of a home.

It suspended its order of invalidity for a period of 24 months to give Parliament an opportunity to correct the constitutional defects in the two

Offence

It would therefore not be a criminal offence to use or be in possession of cannabis for personal consumption, in a private space.

This also extended to cultivating cannabis in a private place for personal consumption in private.

Zondo took the view that it should be left to Parliament to decide on the quantity of cannabis that an adult person may use, possess or cultivate in order for it to amount to "personal use".

He said that a police officer would have to consider all the circumstances, including the quantity of cannabis found in an adult person's possession.

If the police officer, on reasonable grounds, suspects that the person concerned is in possession of that cannabis for dealing and not for personal consumption, the officer may arrest the person. The courts will ultimately decide whether the person was in possession of cannabis with the intent to deal or for own consumption. (Daily Mail)

Dagga ruling a joint victory, now to weed out the details

THE State's arguments on the limitation of the use of dagga went up in smoke as Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo gave the green light for personal dagga consumption.

"The right to privacy is not confined to a home or private

dwelling. It will not be a criminal offence for an adult person to use or be in possession of cannabis in private space," Zondo said. The court gave Parliament 24 months to update legislation relating to marijuana to be in line with its ruling. This is a joint

victory for Dagga Party leader Jeremy Acton and Rastafarian Garreth Prince who argued on December 13 and 14, 2016, for the decriminalisation of the herb.

There are still several technical issues to weed out, though, such as the amount of dagga a person can legally have in their possession.

"The judgment does not specify how many grams of cannabis can a person use or have in private," Zondo said. (Daily Mail)

You can't light up in public

Phephelaphi Dube, director at the Centre for Constitutional Rights, told News24 that she viewed the judgment as "cautiously progressive".

"It balances, on the one hand, the right to privacy and associated entitlements such as dignity and wellbeing against the need to maintain a lawful and orderly society.

"With due deference to the separation of powers, it will be up to Parliament to determine the lawful quantities that individuals may cultivate and consume." (Daily Mail)

Eswatini Elections Support Network (EESN) on Primary Elections' Preliminary Report

The Eswatini Elections Support Network under CANGO would like to clarify its position regarding its Preliminary report issued on August 27°, 2018, by the Chairperson on the National Primary Elections held on 25 August 2018.

EESN is an independent and nonpartisan network set up in 2003 by CANGO to observe elections with a view to provide an independent opinion on how elections are conducted. In 2018, EESN deployed 120 observers during the nominations and primary elections. The local observers were trained on what to report and observe in elections.

The basis of the mission is to observe compliance with the Constitution, national laws and the international instruments such as SADC Guideline on Elections. The preliminary report issued after elections highlighted major issues observed. Hence, it is not a comprehensive report.

The EESN Observers observed the following: the time of opening of Polling Stations or centre; the environment outside and Inside the Polling Centre; accessibility to polling stations; orderliness; voting procedures and; counting and announcement of results.

We note the concerns raised on the conclusion that the elections were free and fair. It must be understood that as elections are still ongoing, the statement was not giving an overall assessment of the elections. What was essentially being stated was that on the day of elections most of the election processes allowed the voters to cast their votes in an environment that was not intimidating as well as facilitated the secrecy of the vote.

We would like to reiterate that indeed the elections were peaceful in most of the polling stations; security forces were visible and did not interfere with elections; the counting process was also peaceful and orderly; most candidates had a chance to validate the results; there were also no campaigning materials in the polling stations.

The EBC team which conducted elections did their best to ensure that the voting process was efficient.

State 'allows you to smoke yourself to cancer', says Rastafarian activist

RASTAFARIAN activist Garreth Prince was on colourful display before the justices of the Constitutional Court on Tuesday as he argued for his right to smoke marijuana in public.

A barefoot Prince, dressed in a long red, yellow and green robe, said he just wanted the freedom to use marijuana without being victimised.

"The harm that the criminal justice system has to a cannabis smoker is worse than a joint can ever inflict," he argued during the state's application for leave to appeal against the judgment and order of the Western Cape High Court.

Several members of the Rastafarian community were seen outside court dressed in their colourful regalia. Some members were seen smoking marijuana, while others sang and danced to drums. Some of their placards read: "My body, my decision".

A metre away from the crowd were a few police officers who kept a close watch.

Arrests

Prince told the justices that the Rastafarian community was "small and marginalised and this court should give effect to our plight".

He said the order made by the High Court, regarding the private use of dagga, allowed users to be victimised. "It [the order] still allows the police to arrest us. The state arrests me because it says it cares about my health - I would hate to see what they would do if they hate me."

Earlier in 2017, the High Court ruled that the cultivation and private use of dagga should be legalised. (Daily Mail)

A dark cloud has struck the legal fraternity.

Veteran Manzini-based lawyer Leo Mduduzi Gama passed away on Monday night after battling with cancer of the throat for quite some time.

Gama, an experienced legal eagle polished by years of courtroom litigation, succumbed to death at his home in Manzini around 9:30pm surrounded by close friends and family.

According to a relative, who preferred to remain anonymous because he had not been mandated by the family to speak to the media, Gama had been in and out of South African hospitals after being diagnosed with throat cancer not so long ago.

"We knew he was ill because he had been battling with this thing for quite some time but we did not expect this. We are still shattered by what has happened. We were expecting him to recover and return to work, especially because the cancer had not reached an advanced stage," said the close family relative.

Interviewed yesterday, Secretary General of the Law Society of Swaziland (LLS), Bongani 'Bhanyaza' Mdluli confirmed Gama's death.

However, Mdluli politely requested not to elaborate much on the issue and referred more questions to the

"We have just been informed of the sad news and we are still shocked beyond measure. Please kindly direct all your questions to the family. The Law Society will issue a statement in due course," said an obviously devastated Mdluli.

Meanwhile, news of Gama's demise spread like wild fire yesterday morning on most social media platforms.

One of his brothers was the first to make the announcement on Gama's official Facebook page.

"It is with great sadness that I announce the death of my brother Leo Mduduzi Gama. He passed on peacefully yesterday at 9:30pm 17.09.2018 surrounded by close friends and family. The family is humbled by the outpouring love, support and prayers we have received. May your soul rest in peace Gama Mahlobo loluhlata," he wrote. This post attracted over 100 comments, mostly from local lawyers.

Gama was one of the senior attorneys in the country, having been admitted into the bar almost 20 years ago. He ran an established law firm at the Lighaga Building in Manzini and has been a fully-fledged member of the LLS all his working life.

Throughout his illustrious career. Gama handled a host of high profile cases, including the recent mysterious case of businessman, Almor Oliveria, who is believed to have been murdered. Gama was representing one of the suspects, Dao Thanta Hue. in that case which is still pending. He also represented police officer Lucky 'Obama' Matsenjwa in the much publicised fingerprints case.

In 2010, Gama appeared on behalf of Bhekumusa Sipho Mamba, who was convicted at the High Court for the murder of his girlfriend whom he killed by cutting offher head using a bush-knife. His family is yet to announce the funeral details.

EBC tightens security, special voting goes smoothly

THE Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) tightened security yesterday during the secondary elections special voting so as to ensure the smooth progress of the exer-

The security was tightened at the entrance of the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre where the exercise was taking place

Only the people who worked at the essential services organisations were allowed to enter so as to cast their votes.

Plain clothed officers from these organisations were required to produce proof that they indeed worked for such organisations before gaining entry. Those that were wearing uniforms were required to go straight to the voting stations. This time, polling officers were also required to produce proof that they were such. Even candidates did not gain entry without showing proof that they were candidates either for MP or indvuna yenkhundla.

Every person was required to produce a national identity card (ID) and any other card that proved eligibility to vote on the day.

The other card could be a polling officer or candidate name tag. Others were required to produce accreditation tags to show that they were eligible to either vote or be at the voting station yesterday. EBC Commissioner Ncumbi

Maziya was among the officers who were making sure that order was restored throughout the day. He was reprimanding every person that tried to act smart by forcing his or her way in. Even presiding officers were not spared from Maziya's wrath on the day.

He made it clear that they were making his work difficult as he, and his team from EBC and police, were maintaining order at the gate.

The presiding officers would be seen at the gate from time to time, wanting to get in and out of the trade centre. EBC Head of Secretariat Richard Phungwayo said they had planned for the security to be even tighter this time. "After the primary elections special voting, we sat down and identified problems that resulted in the challenges we had. Last time, many people wanted to take chances and vote yet they were not eligible. This time, we could not allow that," Phungwayo said.

He further stated that they issued name tags for all polling officers, which were to be used by them upon entry yesterday. He said they also observed that people did not respect time and this time, they tried to correct that. Members of the uniformed forces were allocated from 0700 to 1100 hours to vote.

Other voters were allowed to vote from 1100 to 1600 hours and from 1600 hours it was a chance for presiding officers to cast their vote.

EBC explains Jan's concern on special voting

Stampede at Mavuso entrance

A near stampede was witnessed at the entrance of the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre as voters wanted to gain entry.

The voters got impatient at the gate as they did not understand why they were made to

EBC officers at the gate wanted the voters to form lines according to the regions in which they were to vote.

This happened from as early as 0700 hours. By 1030 hours, the voters were impatient as some of them claimed that the scorching heat (which reached the maximum of 37 degrees celsius) was getting the better of them.

The voters ended up abandoning the lines they were trying to form and went near the gate. It became difficult to open the gate to let the voters who had voted out. This was because of the fear that voters who were still outside would gain unauthorised entry to the voting station.

Voters tried to push the gate to gain entry but could not because the police made sure that this did not happen.

EBC officials ended up ordering polling officers, who formed part of those who created the near stampede, to assemble at a certain point within the parking lot at Mavuso.

Voted People who had voted were even asked to

use another gate to exit the voting station because at the front gate, people were leaning against the gate and it was difficult to let voters out of the voting station.

This seemed to work in a positive way as the polling officers were given their name tags there and would eventually gain authorised entry in a smooth fashion. By 1300 hours, the situation was better as the number of people who were leaning against the gale decreased.

EBC Head of Secretariat Richard Phungwaye. when asked about this situation, said people had grown impatient. Their impatience had caused the near stampede at the gate. He said many had feared they would go back home Without voting so they thought it was best for them to push and shove yet such would not work for them.

Phungwayo said the voters had to exercise a little patience because inside the voting station, they would not spend more tham five minutes because there was order. Afterwards the officials were able to vote freely, with Out having to be pushed on lines.

SEDCO man conquers Mount Kilimanjaro

TRUE to the adage, never under estimate the power of dreams and the influence of the human spirit.

Despite all harsh conditions that make it humanly impossible to get to the summit of the highest mountain in Africa (Mount Kilimanjaro), Themba Dlamini beat all the odds and braved all fears and hoisted the Eswatini flag at the summit on September 6.

Dlamini, who is a senior strategy manager and organisational performance for the Small Enterprises Development Company (SEDCO), took a personal decision to fulfil a childhood dream to summit the mountain that has claimed the lives of very experienced climbers from all over the world.

Dlamini is the first Liswati to hoist the Eswatini flag at the highest mountain in Africa, about 4 900 metres from its base, and 5 895 metres above sea level. The summit took Dlamini five days as he ventured on the journey from September 1 to 7th. The soft-spoken but brave inexperienced climber thoroughly prepared himself for the making of history. According to Dlamini, he had to hit the gym three times a week with a personal trainer and used the Sibebe Mountain as a dummy.

"In August alone, I did Sibebe six times and during the Sibebe Challenge (August 5), I summited twice. My diet had to change and I had to prepare myself psychologically in readiness for the climb," he said.

Dlamini explained that the climb almost took his life as the weather conditions were not friendly. When he was 700

metres away from the summit, his whole body was failing and he was almost crawling. The first day September 1, saw Dlamini climbing 11 kilometres to reach an altitude of 2 800 metres where he and his chief guide set camp to sleep for the night as each day they had a target.

"The first day was more of a rain forest adventure with low temperatures and a lot of moist from the rain; I even slept on a wet sleeping bag,"he said.

The first two days, according to Dlamini, were an experience of walking in the clouds as it was only on the second day that one gets to see above the clouds.

MZWAKHE MYENI REJECTS RESIGNATION LETTERS FROM FOUR EXECUTIVE MEMBERS

THE Association of Christian Artists in Swaziland (ACASWA) President Mzwakhe Myeni has rejected resignation letters by members of the executive.

Instead, he implored them to go back to work.

About four ACASWA executive members had resigned from the association and these are; Vice-President Frans Dlamini, Secretary General Apostle Vusumuzi Maculuve, PRO Ronnie Dlamini and Pastor Bonginkosi Dludlu.

Upon receiving the resignation letters, the president wrote to the four and advised them to continue working.

Confirming that he indeed received an order to resume his duties, Apostle Maculuve said it was within the association's rights to issue such an order and so it did not bother him.

"Our constitution states that when a member resigns from his duties, the president can either accept or decline that resignation, pending an investigation that should be done in 14 days," he said.

Myeni refuted claims that the ACASWA AGM that had been slated for last Sunday had been cancelled because of reasons above their control. He claimed that the AGM was 'postponed' because a large number of artists subscribing under ACASWA had complained that the notice was too short, but on Friday, he said the reason was because of the national elections.

"Artists complained of the time and so we rescheduled the meeting and it would be held 14 days from now as per our constitution," he claimed.

Myeni referred to their constitution more than once and stated that no member was considered as resigned, all members are expect-

ed to report to the office and carry on with their duties.

The gospel musician said he was aware that there was a plan being 'cooked' at the Ewatini National Council of Arts and Culture (ENCAC) to oust him and his committee, hence the resignations by his col-

leagues. "Kukhona lokuphekwako lesingakwati," he said in vernacular, adding "there is interference from the ENCAC, hence the members' decision to disassociate themselves from the executive so that we do not form a quorum, which will lead to the executive being dissolved, but that will not happen," he said.

Last Friday, a highly placed source reported that the CEO of the ENCAC Stanley Dlamini was in a meeting with ACASWA members who had petitioned Myeni, but delivered the petition to the CEO.

The CEO confirmed to have received reports about the association, but was yet to organise a meeting with the aggrieved members and the current executive.

However, Myeni denied to have been contacted by the CEO's office for any meeting.

THE JOURNEY

...DAY TWO

The second day, according to Dlamini, was physically draining as he had to climb through rocks. The gear had to change and one had to use specialised clothing in order to face the harsh conditions. In the first two days, climbers are expected to avoid cotton but use polyether clothing which lets out moisture and keep warmth.

The climb on this day is more of an experience of walking in the desert, the rise in altitude causes headaches with a loss of appetite. The body starts showing signs of ailing as Dlamini's knees started hurting badly but his anti-inflammatory oil saved the day.

Dlamini explained that the night of day two was the most difficult as he fell sick from the hard wind gashes throughout the night.

...DAY THREE

As things were getting tougher, Dlamini had to employ a strategy where he climbs higher and sleeps low at acclimatisation point for the body to avoid shock as these were new conditions for the

body. The sicknesses got even worse as at this point as he had nausea but his dream to reach the summit kept him going. Dlamini also banked on his medication at this point as he was prepared for the journey, he was now at 3 750 metres above sea level.

....DAY FOUR

This day, according to Dlamini, was by far the most challenging as there was a lot of dust that caused difficulty in breathing. Again, his medication saved the day as he started having congestion problems. On this day, Dlamini had to get to 4 040 metres above sea level and had to climb the baraco wall using his hands.

...DAY FIVE

According to Dlamini, this was yet another tough day as the weather conditions were becoming unbearable. He, at this point, literally had to become a walking wardrobe with four trousers on his body, five pieces of specialised jackets, three thick summit socks and specialised climbing boots. Dlamini reiterated that his knees were hurting and

he had to continually use his medication. Due to having had to abide with the rules, he had to sleep at 17:00 to wake up at 23:00 in order to start the last climb which is the most difficult.

The summit, according to Dlamini, had to happen at day break, the ultimate challenge was 1.3 km a distance he had to cover in seven hours and it was very cold.

"We started to track at midnight and we were at a point where I was physically exhausted, at this point everything was taken away, determination was the only thing keeping me alive," he said.

"When I got to the top, I could not beat the urge to take pictures both for evidence and lifetime memory but both my phones which are high quality (IPhone 8 and Huawei), could not open as it was too cold but I used my other camera to document the experience," he said.

The ice caped summit, according to Dlamini, is rewarding to every climber and those who make it alive to the summit are only allowed 15 minutes at

VOTERS ARRESTED FOR STABBING EACH OTHER OVER MP CANDIDATES

TWO voters from Nhlambeni area have been arrested after a nasty fight which resulted to one of them being stabbed with a knife.

The fight emanated from an argument, whereby the voters could not agree on who to vote for during the secondary elections expected to take place on Friday.

The two; Bheki Lukhele and Elliot Mathunjwa have since made their court appearances at the Manzini Magistrate's Court.

Information gathered from sources is that Mathunjwa was in the company of his friends when he was approached by Lukhele from the same area.

Lukhele is alleged to have asked Mathunjwa on who he would vote for to represent the people of Nhlambeni in Parliament.

Mathunjwa is said to have told Lukhele who he was going to vote for, little did he know that the person he intended voting for was not Lukhele's favourite. Lukhele is alleged to have started getting aggressive, asking Mathunjwa why he decided to vote for his (Lukhele's) candidate's rival. Lukhele is alleged to have retrieved an iron rod and started assaulting Mathunjwa all over the body.

Danger

Information gathered is that Mathunjwa tried to run away, but he could not outpace Lukhele who was assaulting him. Seeing that his life was in danger, Mathunjwa is alleged to have drawn a knife and fought back, stabbing Lukhele. The police

were later called and the two were anested. Both accused persons appeared before Manzini Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini. Mathunjwa was the first to make his way into the dock.

He was charged with assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm in that on Sunday while at Nhlambeni, he stabbed Bheki Lukhele with a sharp object on his upper body.

The accused pleaded guilty to the charge, the crown represented by Fakazi Mngomezulu applied that the accused be remanded back into custody pending recovery of the com-

plainant. Lukhele, who was also court, could not walk properly to the stab wound. Mathunjwa applied for bail, which he was granted at it was fixed at E3 000. The accuse was informed to come back to control today. Bheki Lukhele was then could to enter the dock as an accused person. However, the magistrate said he could not hear Lukhele's material because he is also a complainant of the same case.

Mother of 2 arrested for stabbing, assaulting hubby's lover

A 29-year-old woman has been arrested for stabbing and assaulting her husband's alleged lover with an umbrella.

Fezile Sifundza, a mother of two, bit and stabbed her husband's alleged lover, Magi Sibiya (27) with an umbrella at Vusweni last Friday.

After the assault, Sibiya reported the incident to the Pigg's Peak police who made an arrest.

Speaking at the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court on Monday, the accused said she knew that Sibiya was in a relationship with her husband because she once caught them hugging.

"The whole incident was done in self-defence. Friday while I was going to the local bus stop, I ran into Sibiya who first looked at me and then laughed. This angered me and I asked her why she was laughing. Sibiya then tried to stab me with an umbrella in the stomach and this infuriated me such that a fight between the two of us ensued," the accused said. Sifundza added that she had two children with her husband, thus could not allow to be stabbed.

"I held the umbrella and assaulted my attacker with slaps. I punched her while I was trying to pull the umbrella away from her. It was during the pulling of the umbrella that resulted in me

biting her twice on the left arm. Sibiya then fell to the floor and I trampled on her. After the fight, the police came and arrested me. I have not seen my husband since the fight. I feel that the reason why Sibiya

was laughing at me was because she knew that she was ruining my marriage," she added.

Senior Magistrate Siphosini Dlamini told Sifundza that she should have reported Sibiya to the police instead

of assaulting her, as the whole incident looked like a trap.

"You should never take the law into your own hands. This whole thing looks like a trap where Sibiya knew she could provoke you and you will assault her. Now you are arrested and your husband

and Sibiya might be having their relationship inside your bedroom while you rot in jail. I will sentence you on September 20, and in the meantime, will remain in police custody," he said.

Govt wants Mananga, Ngwenya borders operational hours extended

GOVERNMENT wants Mananga Border Gate operational hours extended by two hours, while Ngwenya must operate for 24 hours.

Currently, Mananga opens from 0700 to 1800 hours, whereas Ngwenya operates from 0700 to 0000 hours.

The proposed changes would see Mananga closing business at 2000 hours.

These two gates link the country with South Africa. Principal Secretary at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation Joel Nhleko said during the anticipated discussions with their South African counterparts, they would negotiate for an extension in the operational hours of the two borders.

This is contrary to reports that South Africa wants to shutdown non-commercial border posts like Gege.

Nhleko said his office has not received any official communication on the subject.

He said South Africa had not indicated what it would table at the round table when meetings start.

However, he was optimistic that South Africa would not table the matter of shutting down non-commercial border gates between the two countries.

He said the PS at the Ministry of Home Affairs Anthony Masilela would be in a better position to interrogate the issue further as his ministry was on the ground. Masilela, when contacted, said his office was also not aware of the matter.

The extension of the hours, Nhleko said, would see Ngwenya Border Gate operate for 24 hours, because it is the busiest crossing gateway and played a massive role in the relationship with South Africa. He said it was not enough that the border was operating until 0000 hours.

Of note, presently, only Mhlumen Border Gate operates for 24 hours This gateway links the country with Mozambique.

On the other hand, when giving resons on why government intends to increase operational hours at Mananet to 2000 hours, Nhleko said the entry point was mostly used by business people who operate between the country and South Africa.

Congestion

"The proposal has been that it should close at 2000 instead of 1800 hours to alleviate the congestion," Nhleko stated.

He said the country is still in discussion with their South African counterparts on the matter.

The PS said he was hopeful that the subject would be discussed by the two countries' governments.

In the country, Parliament was dissolved by His Majesty King Mswall III on June 20. MPs last day was June 30, while Cabinet ministers, who had been known as Sigejane, were dissolved in the past week.

This means the awaited discussions might resume after the country has elected a new government around October.

So far, operational hours are only extended during the festive season and the Easter holidays.

IRREGULARITIES UNCOVERED BY PHALALA FUND PROBE

THE Parliamentary Select Committee appointed to probe the administration of Phalala Fund uncovered several irregularities in the administration of the scheme.

The committee intended to table the report on their findings, but since their term ended, such was never debated and recommendations have not been implemented, worsening the plight of patients. As per the report, there are several irregularities in the administration of the fund which put the lives of Emaswati in danger.

One major problem was the debt that resulted in the banning of Eswatini patients. The report states that 86 per cent of service providers are owed by Eswatini government and it (government) disregarded advice from Healthshare which resulted in the service providers banning patients from

the countr

The delays in Phalala fund payments according to the report, resulted from the fact that there was no personnel solely assigned to deal with payments at the treasury department.

"There is no focal person engaged by the treasury department to deal with Phalala Fund payments thus the delays. There is no officer designated to reconcile fund creditors at treasury department, furthermore, there is poor methodology in paying debts, as there is inconsistence," reads the report as part.

Providers

Service providers are reportedly not treated with respect and dignity as there is no communication between them and government which resulted in the debts escalating due to arrears.

The probe team further observed that the country spends millions in transferring patients through the fund, while it would be cost effective for it to purchase equipment for specialised clinical services.

"The country does not have a facil-

ity and equipment to attend to the specialised clinical services, yet millions go out of the country instead of servicing a loan for our hospital. There is no tender used to locate service providers, but Healthshare headhunted specialised services," reads the report

Challenges

Among other challenges faced by the patients that were noted in the report are expensive medical visas.

The probe team observed that there is a chronic immigration problem at the boarder gate experienced by Eswatini patients especially with the accruing of a medical visa.

"Only one ordinary lodging facility is used, the second one is a semi admission centre where patients who cannot be looked after are accommodated in the wards. Patients do not lodge in people's facilities to make money," further states the team.

The team reported that not all service providers halted services to local patients.

Govt must pay service providers E60 million - probe recommends

THE committee recommended a consideration of a waiver so as to lift the ban and start attending to emergency cases on cancer patients.

The team also recommended that the ministry of health engages qualified personnel as a Phalala Fund Administrator as the current one is not competent to handle the task of this magnitude on its own.

On the poor administration of the fund, the team said a seasoned administrator must be appointed to direct, monitor, and control resources including patients.

Addressing the failure of government to settle its debts to the service providers, the committee recommended that-

government must maintain consistent payments with the service providers and the intermediary forum.

"Government is to immediately formalise payment to the sum of E60 million to the indebted service providers," reads the report.

Probe

The probe team also recommended that government should schedule meetings with HealthShare, and the service providers which should be held yearly to mitigate such debts.


Furthermore, there is need for mutual communication between the service providers as well as HealthShare by government.

Government should consider open-


ing up an oncology centre in the country. The need to consider establishing a satellite office is to expedite the process of helping referral cases

Seeing as that the government failed to work with the parliamentary select committee, it was recommended that government must collaborate with the Parliament Select Committee as it exercises its constitutional right of oversight. "There is urgent need for proper accounting methods to be used to remit creditors of Phalala Fund. Government to quarterly report in Parliament on the welfare of debt and creditors of Phalala Fund to avoid such anomalies," further recommends the probe team.

Eswatini HIV break-through: From HIV positive to testing 'HIV negative'- 7 years later

HAVE you wondered why is it that nowadays you rarely see people who are thin and pale, whether in hospital beds or going to hospital while this was common in the past?

Apart from achieving the first two of the '90-90-90' targets, Eswatini takes strides in the HIV/AIDS battle and has managed to supress the viral load to a level where it is undetectable.

Zandile Simelane (26) could not believe it when she went to a facility recently and tested HIV negative after living with HIV for about seven years.

This, she said had always been her dream from the first day she tested HIV positive.

After a year of the test and start intervention, the country achieved '90-90-90' which is the goal of the United Nations (UN) programme on HIV/AIDS to identify 90 per cent of individuals with HIV-infection, get 90 per cent of those patients into treatment, and get 90 per cent of the treated patients to achieve undetectable viral loads.

The latter is reflected by one testing negative after having been diagnosed with HIV before. Simelane is one good example.

In what has come as encouragement to people living with HIV, Simelane who seven years ago tested HIV positive, has come out to share how she has managed to test 'HIV negative'.

Even though she recently tested negative, Simelane is fully aware that this does not mean that the virus is no longer in her body. She categorically states that this means the virus has been supressed to a level where it is now Undetectable and Untransmutable (U=U). For this reason, she has vowed to continue adhering to stipulations of the anti-retroviral treatment (ART).

"What we might not all know is that after being on ART consistently (everyday) and accordingly (time), such medication supresses the virus' activity within six weeks of correct uniform intake. Which could possibly result in one testing HIV negative and that was my dream," she said.

"Awaiting the results was obviously not as nerve wrecking as it was seven years ago. It was kind of nice actually, knowing the worst, but hoping for the best still. Anyways, I tested HIV negative which in the Positive World is called U=U (Undetectable=Untransmutable)," she added.

Negative

She said such does not mean that she would stop her ART treatment, behave like she is HIV negative or engage in unprotected sexual intercourse, but instead she will continue fighting the virus with healthy habits.

"I am fighting the virus with healthy habits and self-caring acts. Self-caring could mean, wine/beer intake from time to time. Ok, I just love my beer. It has taken alarms, friends and family to 'remind' me of the exhausting reality I have every day at 2200 hours. Cheers to Adherence," she added on a post she shared on her Facebook account.

Some of the observations made by Simelane in the battle against HIV/AIDS in the country was that unlike in the past, where counselling was in-depth, nowadays the counselling is shallow in some of the facilities.



HABITUAL OFFENDER GETS 5 YEARS FOR ROBBING WOMAN E1 48

A habitual offender was thrown back into prison for five years without an option of a fine after he was found guilty of robbing a woman of her belongings worth E1 480.

Mduduzi Hlatshwayo (34) of Matsetsa appeared before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso where he conducted his own defence.

He was facing two counts of robbery and malicious damage to property. On the first count, the accused is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully robbed Sanelisiwe Tsabedze of her items valued at the said amount.

He is said to have used violence to induce submission of the items as he threatened to hack her with a bush-knife if she resisted to the taking of the items.




On a different date, the accused is said to have unlawfully and intentionally damaged a door which belonged to Kenny Ndwandwe. When the charges were read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty to both of them. The Crown, however, elected to call witnesses to prove commission of the offences.

The first complainant told the court that she was at Lonhlupheko bus station when the accused person attacked her and demanded that she surrenders her belongings. The accused is said to have stabbed the complainant once with the bush-knife and further threatened to cut her throat if she resisted the demands.

When he was given time to cross-examine the complainant, the accused elected to remain silent. He was accordingly found guilty on both counts. The Crown, which was represented by prosecutor Nomphumelelo Msibi, informed the court that the accused had previous cases which includ-

Hlatshwayo is said to have once served seven years in a correctional facility after he was found guilty of rape. On judgment, Hlatshwayo was sentenced to five years in a correctional facility without an option of a fine on the first count while he was sentenced to 10 months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine on the second one.

A case of driving while under the influence of alcohol had to be postponed and set for trial after the accused person pleaded not guilty to the charge. Sandile Matsenjwa (36) appeared before the Siteki Magistrate's Court after he was nabbed by police under the traffic depart-

He was charged with contravening the Road Traffic Act of 2007.

According to the charge sheet, the accused person wrongfully and unlawfully drove a motor vehicle, a VW Golf 4 sedan, while under the influence of an intoxicating substance.

The charge reflects that the accused was subjected to a breathalyser test, which subsequently indicated that he had an alcohol content reading of 0.87 mg/l in his system.

This is above the legal limit which stands at 0.37 mg/l.

During his appearance before the court, the accused elected to conduct his own defence after he was informed of his rights to legal representation.

He proceeded to plead not guilty to the charge after it was read to him.

The accused emphasised that he did not commit the said offence.

Postponed

This prompted the Crown to file an application to have the matter postponed to today as it intends to call witnesses to prove commission of the offence.

The accused was granted bail set at E500 and ordered to return to court on the said date for the commencement of

Meanwhile, Thabiso Mamba (28) faced a similar charge of contravening the Road Traffic Act.

He is said to have driven a Toyota Quantum, a public transport vehicle, while under the influence of alcohol.

The content of alcohol in his system is said to have read as 0.42 mg/l, which is higher than the limit of 0.10 mg/l for public transport drivers.

Mamba pleaded guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence.

He then asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying he was tempted to take a few sips from a friend's drink.

He was accordingly found guilty and sentenced to 60 days in a correctional facility with an option to pay E1 500 fine.

Executive summary

- 1. The Eswatini Communications Commission is a Communications Commission Act, 2013 charged with the duty to regulate and supervise the operation of electronic communications networks and the provision of electronic communications services in Eswatini.
- On or about 8 February 2018, the Eswatini Findings Communications Commission (ESCCOM Thereinafter) received a complaint from other 6. The Investigation

TERTIARY ENROLLM DWESTINTHEWORL

WHILE government attempts to improve and prioritise the country's education, it has since emerged that Eswatini's tertiary enrollment is the lowest in the world.

Out 67 per cent of pupils who enroll in secondary education, only five percent register for tertiary education in the country.

According to Romeela Mohee, Education Specialist in Higher Education from the Commonwealth of Learning, the country's enrollment is the worst across the globe.

She was speaking on Monday at the University of Eswatini(UNESWA) during a public lecture marking the celebration of 50 years of academic progress and the role of blended learning in higher education.

Thrive

Mohee said the country should at least thrive to have half of the 67 per cent enroll in tertiary, so that they can contribute to the country's socio-economic development.

"The country has a huge role to play in empowering the other 61 per cent of students to enroll in tertiary institutions," she said.

Mohee said every year the enrollment statistics are being monitored and there is no single year that the numbers increase.

She said blended learning (online courses) can help improve the country's tertiary enrollment as more students would easily register for courses

Mohee said the country would not need infrastructure for the enrollment of the students and a massive number of Emaswati can register.

Period

"One lecturer can reach a huge number of students in a limited period. A massive number of students can benefit from one lecturer's lecture as compared to a classroom lesson," she said.

She said students can study at their own pace and that working citizens can easily partake in blended learning, study during the weekend and off days.

Blended learning is key - Vice Chancellor

THE University of Eswatini (UNESWA) Acting Pro Vice Chancellor, Mike Masuku says the university needs blended learning to increase tertiary student intake.

He said UNESWA only admits 40 per cent of qualifying students

"What happens to the remaining 60 per cent of Emaswati that have finished their high school education?" he wondered.

With blended learning, the vice chancellor said the remaining 60 per cent of the students can easily undergo blended learning.

Masuku further encouraged Emaswati to partake in blended learning and not wait for many years to get a chance to enroll full time in the institution.

Lecturers trained on online learning

SEVENTEEN University of Eswatini (UNESWA) lecturers have undergone an online training equipping them for lecturing the blended learning to Eswatini students.


UNESWA's acting Vice Chancellor, Justice Thwala said with the support of the Commonwealth Learning, the institute has organised many workshops on blended learning and online learning. However, Thwala said UNESWA's triad mandate remain 'research, learning and community service'.

To enhance the quality of online teaching-learning, the chancellor

said UNESWA intends to produce video lessons to satellite platforms in all the administrative regions of the country.

"Doing this would enable students to have access to lectures from various centres regardless of their location," Thwala said. He said using technology for teaching and learning enables the students' access to global network of education and knowledge. She said once elected, she will also make sure that the children of the constituency get access to pre-school education


"Pre-school should be the basic of every child, thus all children should undergo pre-school education," she said.





REFRESH WHAT YOU THINK..

DO you ever feel like you need a break? Like you could just take five and be free from it all. Not that there is something wrong with it, but because you realise that you have been complying too much and you could use a break.

That moment when you feel so drained and you start questioning exactly whose idea it was. Suddenly you remember that nobody forced you into it- just that it was the "normal" or "good" thing to do.

Discover

For a second there, you discover that actually, you cannot do both. In fact, you discover that there is a long list of things you could never be mainly because they are defined and named by someone else outside your body. You look at the standards and immediately know that you could never be hot or sexy enough. You still comply anyway because that is what is "normal". Probably as normal as the era of wearing corsets. Other writers argue that "it was vital to the creation of the ideal feminine shape, cinching in the waist but remaining desirably plump in other areas of the body.

This aspired silhouette was enmeshed in larger constructions of femininity that emphasised the need for women's self-regulation and the regulation of appetite and that, further, linked the small waist to affluence and high social standNOTGOOD ENOUGH



ing". Definitely normal.

Perhaps just like masculinity is considered to be this restrictive box where society has forced our buff, six-packed with abs and biceps to die for; femininity is a space for oppression and sexual commodification.

Since our black and white TVs, the female body has long been idealised, objectified and fetishised. Perpetuating this stereotype has been how girls have been socialised to respond with aptness to

these expectations like some transnational company responding to market conditions.

Femininity has been encoded within rules and guidelines on how the female body should look and be dressed- and that is what has been termed to be "normal".

As if that was not enough, beyond society's definition of what is normal, the attitude of society towards women further entrenched the oppression of women. As we commemorate 16 Days

of Activism Against Gender Based Violence, we need the honesty, at least to ourselves, to admit that violent behaviours are held in place by social norms and unequal power relations. Society has cultivated attitudes in men and boys that promote violence against women and girls. The fathers whom the boys look up to and idolise have been beating their wives for as long as their children could see.

These are the children who hid under the kitchen tables when their father was chasing their mother around the house with a knobkerrie. Fast-forward to today, they cite their fathers as references in their arguments to justify why they abuse their wives. They find it normal because their fathers did it and their friends at Gobidolo Shebeen

We clearly need to find a way to redefine these norms and influence the attitudes held by the people, especially men and boys about women if we are serious about eliminating gender based violence. Girls and women who mutilate voluntarily mutilate themselves to fit-in need to hold a mirror against their faces and speak to themselves what it means to be "hot" and "sexy", if it is even necessary. Before we are exposed to lack of freedom in our countries, may the first demand be freedom "in our bodies", from societal norms and attitudes. Is there not a song that says "...even though we have potbellies, fat thighs, chubby arms...our hearts still give good loving"? Women refuse to be held hostage by these often ill-informed, short-sighted and sorry norms. Sometimes we will choose to not traumatise our bodies with spanx and waist-trainers. Hello, C-H-O-I-C-E!

Education can help protect sawfishes in Moza, Madagascar

OF all sharks and rays worldwide, sawfishes related to stingrays and manta rays - are considered to be the family at greatest risk of extinc-

The long, toothed saw - which gives them their unique appearance - also makes them extremely vulnerable to entanglement in fishing nets. Their numbers have fallen because they are caught accidentally in industrial fishing nets. In addition to that, they are targeted by some fishermen because their fins can fetch high prices. There are five species of sawfish globally. Two can reach around

seven metres in total length (including the saw), making them the third largest members of the shark and ray family. Sawfishes were formerly common along both the west and east coasts of Africa.

Knowledge

Until a few years ago there was no knowledge of whether they still inhabited these waters, or if populations had plummeted as they have done elsewhere. I set about addressing this gap six years ago. Since then, I have interviewed more than 500 fishers in six different African countries. I collected

information on when and where people last caught sawfishes, how they used them and what their local value was. My research showed that sawfishes are now locally extinct from many parts of West Africa, but are still encountered - at least occasionally - by fishers in Madagascar and northern Mozambique.

Working in fishing communities and engaging in the lives of fishers has provided me with some insights into how sawfishes can best be protected in countries like Madagascar, as well as an understanding of the approaches that won't work. In the

WHY INQUIRY INTO CORRUPTION IN SANEEDS TO ACT WITH URGENCY

A commission of inquiry into corruption in South Africa is underway. How it goes about its work, and delivers on its mandate, will have profound constitutional and political consequences.

This is more so because it is clear that deposed former president Jacob Zuma, who is at the core of the allegations, has launched a fightback campaign that can undermine President Cyril Ramaphosa's efforts to clean up government.

The remit of the commission, which is headed by Constitutional Court Deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo, is to establish the extent of what's become known as "state capture" by rogue elements in government. Its findings will reveal how the country's democracy was so imperilled within two decades of its founding election in 1994. It'll also help ensure that the necessary remedial action is taken to prevent

South Africa needs to find out how Zuma and his cronies, the Gupta family, were able to exploit weaknesses in the country's governance system.

To perform its role effectively, a judicial commission must act as an inquisitorial inquiry whose job is to find out what happened and why. This requires it to refrain from acting like a normal (adversarial) court of law. The commission isn't a substitute for criminal prosecution or, for that matter, civil litigation.

A great deal flows from this foundational point. Zondo's job isn't to "follow the money" as some have suggested. Important features of the corporate labyrinth built by the Guptas and their allies and accomplices has already been uncovered, for example, the property holdings of the Gupta family, or examined in court proceedings.

The commission's job isn't to track the flow of funds or any money-laundering machines. That will be the job of the criminal courts, as and when they get the chance. Instead, Zondo should grapple with the politics

of state capture. He needs to get under the skin of the politics of state capture; to get on record why and what happened; and to make clear findings of political accountability. Speed is of essence. He needs to move fast enough that the commission maintains momentum and does not allow Zuma and other implicated parties to get out ahead

of it, or to seek to tilt

public opinion in their

PROCESS AND POWERS

To evaluate the commission's progress, it is important to keep in mind its terms of reference and its powers. What can Zondo investigate and what can the commission do about whatever it uncovers?

Firstly, its terms of reference are deep, but narrow. Seven of the nine elements of the terms of reference refer directly to the Guptas' or Zuma's interference with government decision-making and procurement. The remaining two invite a broader inquiry into state procurement.

So the terms of reference are essentially confined to the Gupta family and its relationship with the democratic state - from the presidency and the Cabinet, down through state agencies and stateowned enterprises, and down deep into the executive arm of government.

In digging for the truth, those responsible for what happened will - or should - be identified by the commission so that they can be held to account.

But what powers does the commission have to take remedial action to address any wrongdoings it uncovers?

Very little. Certainly, far less than people seem to think. The commission's task is to investigate and report back to Ramaphosa, which may include recommendations.

These recommendations are not, per se, binding. The commission is essentially a fact-

finding mission and does not have the power to make orders. So the report could say, for example, that criminal activity has been committed, and the commission may refer the matter for prosecution or further investigation. the But:

prosecutorial authorities don't have to wait for the conclusion of the

commission process. Indeed, they should be following the proceedings closely and initiating action wherever it suggests that criminality may have occurred.

Uncertainty about this point has led to some procedural confusion during the opening fortnight, particularly around whether those implicated would have an opportunity to cross-examine.

Unfortunately, Zondo let the matter fester unnecessarily before finally ruling on September 11. He had little difficulty dismissing the application of the Gupta brothers on the basis that they are, in essence, fugitives from justice who are unwilling to come back to South Africa to give evidence to the commission. In the case of Zuma's son, Duduzane, he granted the application to cross-examine.

This may be justified. But it may also be a red herring. The best commissions of inquiry are those with strong "counsel for the inquiry" who don't just lead evidence of one side of a story, but who test the evidence as they go along, adding to its weight and credibility, in pursuit of a robust version of the truth.

HIGH STAKES

There are anxieties about Zondo's pace. It is worth remembering that this commission derives from the report on state capture by former public protector Thuli Madonsela. Because she had had neither sufficient time nor resources to complete her work, appointing a judicial commission of inquiry was the remedial action that had to be taken.

Madonsela wanted the commission to complete its work in six months. It was a rather optimistic target. But it wasn't entirely unreasonable provided that the commission focused on the narrow scope set by the terms of reference, and organised its procedure in a lean and equally focused manner.

Zondo has asked for an additional two years. It is very far from clear why he needs so long and has led the lobby group, the Council for the South African Constitution, to join the court proceedings to object to any extension.

Regardless, the commission needs to act as swiftly as it can. South Africans are being reminded daily that Zuma may have left office, but that he still is capable of muddying the waters. If it focuses efficiently on its core task, and evidence of the political conspiracy that underpinned the state capture project is adduced and tested, the proceedings of the commission may serve to keep a lid on Zuma's fightback campaign.

The stakes are very high for all concerned - for Ramaphosa's political future, and for the country he leads. The Conversation

Ex-offenders in SA should get a resettlement grant; Here's why...

grant for a transitional period after serving their sentences. The grant would provide thousands who re-enter society every year with some income while they try to put their lives back together.

Ex-offenders with a criminal record find it hard to reintegrate into society when they're released. More often than not, they are returned to prison because they can't make it on the outside. Most ex-offenders are stigmatised and find it impossible to find a job. Research on former prisoners shows that finding employment is perhaps the most daunting obstacle facing released ex-offenders in South Africa. The grant proposal by the Department of Correctional Services is an innovative idea and should be taken seriously. But the department has met with a lot of opposition.

Many argued that a grant would be equavalent to "rewarding" ex-offenders for their crimes. The rejection of DCS's proposal is a pity. My own research found that ex-offenders in South Africa suffer from being stigmatised and shamed. This has meant that all previous integration efforts have failed. Accepting the grant proposal would ease the transition and go some way to alleviating the

STIGMA AND SHAME

Criminologists see the reintegration of returning ex-offenders as important to helping curb the tendency of criminals to re-offend. Reintegration strategies need to address the shame inherent in stigmatisation.



The Australian criminologist John Braithwaite made the valuable distinction between two kinds of societal responses to crime and, by extension, ex-offenders. The first is a culture in which offenders are stigmatised and driven away from mainstream culture. Most Western countries (including the US and the UK, as well as South Africa) fall into this category. In the second what he called integrative shaming cultures offenders are also shamed but once the punishment has run its course, they're accepted back as a full member of that society. What's notably absent from this response is stigma. China and Japan take this approach. Research shows that in these cultures, recividism is much lower. Reoffending rates in China at the turn of the century stood at six to eight per cent compared to 86 to 94 per cent in post-apartheid South Africa. The Convesation


PREPARATIONS for this year's World Tourism Day (WTD) are at an advanced stage, with commemorations slated for next week Thursday, at a venue to be announced.

'Customer complaints emanate from lack of knowledge'

THE banking sector continues to deal with many complaints that emanate from customers with little understanding of the services offered by this sector.

This was disclosed by Eswatini Bankers Association (EBA) Chairperson Dennis Mbingo, who was speaking at the launch of schools challenge at the Central bank of Eswatini on Monday.

"People don't know what they don't know and we have seen this in the banking sector through the number of complaints we get from customers due to their lack of knowledge about some of the services we offer," he said.

Mbingo said the drive for the nation to be financially literate would assist in raising awareness, create an enabling environment, provide guidance and support on financial products and services so that financial inclusion activities can thrive.

Mbingo cited findings from a recent Finmark Trust survey which revealed that many consumers lack the skills or the information required to make informed financial decisions.

Mbingo also said people were prevented from unlocking their full economic potential and were thus much more vulnerable to financial shocks.

"This also prevents growth in the financial markets as potential consumers do not take up financial products and are more likely to default on their loans.

So we see the trickle-down effect the absence of financial literacy can have not only on a nation's economy, but on its people as well," he said.

He suggested that for people to become part of the sustainable economic development of the country, there is a need to educate them on basic concepts of savings and available products and services provided by banks.

MOBILE MONEY PAYMENTS FOR PARKING IN MBABANE

IN the spirit of moving with the times and keeping up with the technological tide, Lula Parking, a Mbabane based car parking services company that services 15 of the capital city streets, has joined hands with MTN Eswatini for motorists to pay using the mobile money tap and pay system.

This arrangement was unveiled at a press conference held at the MTN head-quarters in Ezulwini yesterday. Lula Parking Chief Executive Officer Lomkhosi Magagula said the new payment system brings about a lot of convenience to both their customers and their agents who have a time limit of less than three minutes when attending to a customer. The agents, according to Magagula, would from now on carry less cash as they previously were at high risk as they carried a lot of cash with them, thus exposing themselves to pick-pocketers.

Magagula said the mobile money payment arrangement would lessen the ever prevailing threat of revenue loss in the type of business they operate in as some other customers would negotiate their

way out of paying the full amount after parking. Such negotiations, however, are always to the company's detriment. MTN Eswatini CEO Ambrose Dlamini

said Mobile Money has a potential to create mutual value for both subscribers and retail outlets who accept it as an official payment.

This happens through safety, reliabil-

ity and convenience that is part of the use of MTN Mobile Money.

According to Dlamini, using MTN Mobile Money to pay for goods and services means that one stretches the value of a customer's parking, when paying for goods and services, meaning the money that would have been easily seen as 'un-useful change,' can now be accumulated, and used to realise value to the customer in practical terms, like in the payment of parking space, for instance.

Rand gains after dollar's tariff falter

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's rand gained early yesterday as broad dollar weakness supported investor appetite for riskier assets after Washington imposing additional tariffs on Chinese imports.

At 0645 GMT (8:45am local time,) the rand was 0.35 per cent stronger at 14.8750 per dollar compared with its New York close of 14.9275.

Trade-war tensions have intensified as US President Donald Trump imposed additional 10 per cent tariffs on about \$200 billion worth of Chinese imports on Monday.

Washington has imposed tariffs on \$50 billion worth of Chinese products to pressure China to make sweeping changes to its trade, technology transfer and high-tech industrial subsidy policies.

Beijing has retaliated and talks between the world's two largest economies to resolve their trade differences have produced no results. The rand was expected to trade at 14.80 to 15.10 to the dollar yesterday,



according to an early NKC African Economics note. In fixed income, the yield on the benchmark government bond due in 2026 was flat at 9.250 per cent.

Stocks were set to open higher at 0700 GMT, with the JSE securities exchange's Top-40 futures index up 0.07 per cent.

TO FIGHT POVERTY, WORLD SHOULD INVEST IN AFRICA'S YOUTH - B

WASHINGTON - Gates put forward a 'simple idea' that investing in the health and education of Africa's younger generation would help tackle poverty.

The world should help Africa invest in its people as the continent confronts a demographic boom, said billionaire philanthropist Bill Gates, whose foundation released its annual report yesterday.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation released its annual "Goalkeepers" report measuring progress towards achieving UN poverty-reducing goals in 2030. based on an assessment of 18 indi-

While poverty is receding globally, the demographic boom could stall that progress and it could even rise, the report warns.

"If those investments are made in the right way," said the report, young Africans would contribute to the economy and the population growth would likely diminish, as has been the case in other countries. A projection of poverty rates in the report showed that by 2050, more than 40 per cent of extremely poor people in the world will live in just two countries: the Democratic Republic of Congo and Nigeria.

"The particular challenge of the population growth in Africa leads

to a simple idea that the world should help Africa invest in its human capital, and that means both the health and the education of this young generation coming up in Africa," Gates told journalists.

In its annual assessment, the foundation cited progress from Brazil on nutrition, Indonesia for family planning and Vietnam for the quality of education.

Bill and Melinda Gates will cohost an event in New York next week, on the sidelines of the gathering of world leaders at the United Nations, to highlight their campaign for investing in youth.

International court sentences Bemba to time served

KINSHASA - The International Criminal Court on Monday sentenced Congolese politician Jean-Pierre Bemba to a €300 000 fine and a 12 month sentence for witness tampering, but his sentence was reduced to zero due to time already served.

Bemba was acquitted of war crimes on appeal in June, but had already been convicted on the lesser charge of witness tampering during his trial.

The politician has been barred from standing in December's presidential election in the Democratic Republic of Congo because of the conviction.

"Future accused persons can look at Bemba's conviction as a cautionary example as to what

consequences obstructing the administration of justice can have," said judge Bertram Schmitt.

"Bemba's acquittal in the main case should have been the end of his exposure to the court, yet he continues to have the spectre of this institution hanging over him."

Bemba's surprise acquittal on war crimes charges in June raised the prospect he could return to Congo and re-enter politics. A final decision on whether the witness tampering conviction makes him ineligible to stand is expected today.

Bemba headed the Movement for the Liberation of Congo party

and its affiliated militia. After he lost an election to Laurent Kabila in 2006 he was sent to The Hague to stand trial for atrocities committed by his troops in the neighbouring Central African Republic in 2002 and 2003.

His initial conviction was reversed on appeal in June, with judges saying prosecutors had failed to show he had enough control over troops to bear responsibility for their wrongdoing and he could not be convicted beyond a reasonable doubt. However, the witness tampering conviction remains.

Portuguese PM arrives in excolony Angola to mend fences

Minister Antonio Costa touched down in Angola on Monday kicking off a two-day trip designed wimprove ties between Luanda and its former colonial master.

The diplomacy marks an effort to move beyond the bitter legacy of Lisbon's rule over Angola, which ended in 1975 when Portugal withdrew without handing over power. Angola sank into civil war until 2002. "Portugal and Angola have a long history, the tone of which should be defined by the future and not the past," said Costa as he set off for Luanda. Angola entered a new era last year when President José Eduardo dos Santos, who ruled the country with an iron fist from 1979 to 2017, stepped down and

ANGOLA - Portugal's Prime was replaced by João Lourenço.

"There's lots we can and should do together in terms of the economic ties between our countries which are already strong," Costa added shortly after arriving, becoming the first Portuguese head of government to visit in seven years.

"Angola has a major challenge to diversify its economy and to increase domestic production, shrinking imports." Angola is a key trading partner with Portugal, and the thirdlargest recipient of its investments.

A key source of friction was removed in May when a Portuguese court decided that Angola's former vice-president Manuel Vicente can be tried in Luanda, rather than in Portugal, on corruption charges.

100 people killed across 10 states

ABUJA - Floods across 10 states of Nigeria have killed 100 people, a spokesman for the country's emergency and disasters agency said on Monday.

"A national disaster has been declared in four states - Kogi, Niger, Anambra and Delta," said Sani Datti, spokesman for the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), after heavy rain over the past days. National disaster means the federal government has taken over search, rescue and rehabilitation of victims in the worst hit states, which are in central and southern parts of the country.

On Saturday local authorities in Nigeria's southern state of Edo said 30 000 people had been displaced by the floods in more than 35 communities in the eastern and central parts of the state.

The disaster had gone beyond the purview of local government council areas, Aremiyau Momoh, Chairman of Etsako East, told reporters in Benin city, the state capital. '

On his part, John Akhigbe, Chairman of Etsako Central, called for urgent intervention from both the state and the federal governments. The duo said camps for the displaced had been placed in strategic locations across the council areas. Similarly, about 700 houses including large farmlands have been affected by flash floods following heavy rains in parts of oil rich Rivers state. Martins Ejike, a co-ordinator of the National **Emergency Management** Agency (NEMA), told reporters in Port Harcourt, the state capital, that the floods began since August. 'News2

23 die in Ethiopia

ETHOPIA - At least 23 people were killed in a weekend of violence targeting minorities in the ethnic Oromo heartland near Ethiopia's capital Addis Ababa, a police source said. The unrest followed a mass rally on Saturday marking the return to Ethiopia of the leadership of the exiled Oromo Liberation Front (OLF) group, which had fought an insurgency for self-determination for Oromos, Ethiopia's largest ethnic group. Reuters

Armed men attack school

CAMEROON - Armed men attacked a school in Cameroon's southwest English-speaking region, wounding more than 20 people, a government official said on Monday. An unknown number of armed men, using machetes and homemade guns, staged the attack on Saint Joseph's College near Buea late on Sunday, according to South West Region governor Bernard Okalia Bilai. No one was killed, he said. The wounded children were rushed to hospitals and hundreds of parents started pulling their children from schools. "It is a terrible situation. We are not safe at home, our children not safe at school," said Enanga Luisy, a mother of two students. At least half a dozen schools in Buea have asked parents to take home their children.

Nigerian finance minister resigns

ABUJA - Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari last Friday accepted the resignation of Finance Minister Kemi Adeosun, who said she stepped down over allegations of using a forged certificate to avoid participation in the country's mandatory one-year national youth service scheme. Adeosun, a top Cabinet member and a former investment banker who promoted the government's policy to boost growth following a recent recession, said in a statement that she believed she was exempt from the service scheme but felt bound to resign because of the administration's "focus on integrity".

Zim's new sports minister pregnant

HARARE - Zimbabwe's newly appointed Youth, Sport, Arts and Recreation Minister Kirsty Coventry, 34, says she is expecting a child next year with her husband Tyrone Seward. Coventry, broke the news on Twitter this weekend, saying that she and her husband were expecting to be parents in May 2019. According to New Zimbabwe.com, the couple got married in January 2013 after Seward paid "lobola" to the Coventrys for the Olympic medallist, who had earlier said she wanted a traditional marriage. The couple then exchanged their wedding vows in a private ceremony in Harare in August 2013. News24

Two children killed in stampede

LUANDA - Two children and three adults were killed in a stampede at a weekend football match in the Angolan capital Luanda, sparking an investigation, authorities said on Monday. The crush occurred on Saturday as fans were leaving the CAF Champions League quarterfinal match between Primeiro Agosto of Angola and TP Mazembe of the Democratic Republic of Congo, the sports ministry said. The incident "caused the death by asphyxiation of five supporters and caused seven injuries at the end of the match," the ministry said in a statement. The two children were aged 10 and 12, it said.

Thieves steal old hospital brick by brick'

JOHANNESBURG - Confidential patient files, hospital gowns and medical waste have been found scattered around the old De Aar Hospital as thieves dismantle the facility "brick by brick" in the Northern Cape.

The hospital, which was replaced with a new facility, was found in a "terrible state" during an oversight visit last week by councillors and a representative of the ratepayers' association.

"It looks as if staff hurriedly vacated the old premises," said Isak Fritz, DA Northern Cape spokesperson on health. "We discovered confidential patient files and X-rays scattered across the floors. Hundreds, if not thousands of packets of condoms, as well as medical supplies, hospital gowns and even medical waste, in the form of disused syringes, finger prick needles and drip bags, can be found abandoned in the old facility. "Aside from what has been left behind, the building itself is in a terrible state. Not only has it been vandalised but it is also being carried away, bit by bit, with the roof already having been disassembled in certain parts." Fritz has called on health MEC Fufe Makatong to investigate and hold management accountable for the potential health risks and wasted resources left behind. The department of roads and public works, as the custodian of state buildings, will be quizzed about why state property is being allowed to be torn down and purportedly neglected. News24

Ramaphosa urges unity despite plot to oust him

JOHANNESBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa on Monday tore into his detractors, saying the African National Congress (ANC) could not go to war while it was divided with members sabotaging each other.

In apparent reference to the general elections next year, Ramaphosa demanded unity to enable the party to do well. He made his remarks during his opening address at the Congress of South African Trade Unions' (COSATU) 13th national congress held in Midrand. In attendance was ANC Secretary General Ace Magashule, who has been accused of meeting former president Jacob Zuma to plot against Ramaphosa. Magashule has admitted to meeting Zuma at a Durban hotel but denies being part

of a plot to oust Ramaphosa. Ramaphosa urged unity amongst the alliance and said they have to unite in order to win next year's elections. "We should not spend time on counter-revolutionary machinations of weakening the ANC. If there is gonna be any plot, it must be a plot to end poverty," he said.

'What's the hullabaloo?'

MIDRAND - That the ANC met with banks over their decisions to close Gupta accounts is not new information, said the ANC's former secretary general and now National Chairperson Gwede Mantashe, adding that the meetings were held so the party could understand the reasoning behind the closing of the accounts.

He made the comments on the sidelines of trade union federation COSATU's 13th congress, currently underway in Johannesbur. On Monday, Standard Bank Head of Compliance Ian Sinton told the commission of inquiry into state capture about two meetings; one with senior ANC officials and the other with an inter-ministerial committee over the decision by the country's four big banks to stop doing business with the Gupta family. Sinton claimed the meetings were aimed at persuading the bank to reverse its decision to close Gupta-linked bank accounts in 2016.

He revealed that in a meeting that took place at the ANC's Luthuli House Headquarters Mantashe, Deputy Secretary General Jessie Duarte and Head of the economic subcommittee Enoch Godongwana asked if Standard Bank was a part of a "white monopoly capital" campaign aimed at destroying black business.

"I met the banks, that was public. So what is new?" asked Mantashe.

"We met the banks and the meeting with the banks was an open meeting. We don't understand the hullabaloo that we talked to the banks. We did talk to the banks," said the now ANC national chair.

He also insisted that the ANC leadership respected what the banks had to say on the matter. "The purpose of the meeting was for the ANC to have information," he concluded.

The commission is looking into allegations that the Gupta family had undue influence over former president Jacob Zuma and his executive, which family members used to enrich themselves through the looting of state-owned enterprises. ANC President Cyril Ramaphosa also mentioned the state capture commission during his keynote address at the COSATU conference, telling delegates from the federation's affiliates that the resolution at the political party's December conference to support the establishment of a commission of inquiry into state capture was one of the most important outcomes of that event.

PICK A SIDE, SOLLY MSIMANGA TELLS ANC

TSHWANE - Executive Mayor Solly Msimanga has hit back at the ANC in Tshwane, saying the official opposition should make up its mind on addressing corruption.

Msimanga said if the ANC was serious about fighting corruption, it would have supported the suspension of City Manager Dr Moeketsi Mosola as recommended to council, pending the investigation into his role in the GladAfrica tender scandal.

"They would do well to explain to the press and people of Tshwane exactly what their position is on corruption because they have been inconsistent with decisively dealing with allegations of tender irregularity,' Msimanga said. The ANC had earlier called for Msimanga's head and that of Mosola over tender irregularities. During a media brief-

During a media bri ing at Tshwane House, ANC regionChairperson Dr Kgosi Maepa had alleged that Msimanga had for months been aware of the irregular appointment of GladAfrica in a multi-billion rand deal.

According to Maepa, Mosola appointed Bigen Africa on September 17 last year and picked GladAfrica on November 3 without providing a cancellation letter or reasons for the termination to Bigen Africa.

He alleged GladAfrica had received R250 million within only six months of its appointment.

Maepa claimed that although Msimanga claimed he knew nothing of the irregular appointment of GladAfrica, he had in fact known as early as May, according to email correspondence in the ANC's possession.

"We have evidence in the form of an email, letters and correspondence that places the mayor and the MMC of finance at the centre of the corruption."

the information in their possession, Maepa said it was enough for the public protector and other independent bodies to proceed with their investigations.

He said Msimanga could not claim ignorance as it was his role to do oversight on all contracts above R200 000, in which case he neglected his fiduciary duties with regards to the GladAfrica appointment. "If Mosola is to be removed, then the executive mayor must also step down as he is responsible for his actions." But Msimanga said: "I have observed that, true to form, the ANC is again grasping at straws and bringing nothing new to the current discourse of establishing the facts surrounding the appointment of GladAfrica.

"The fact is the ANC has no credibility on corruption and today's flip-flop proved just that." He said the ANC needed to stop paying lip service to transparency and accountability. "If they were truly serious about rooting out corruption, why did they fail to support the suspension of the city manager?" If the ANC caucus had documented proof, they would have produced it already, he said. Msimanga said the ANC "should therefore allow the probe to continue without "more lies or undue influence". *Independent Online*

FLORENCE - Deadly storm Florence drenched North Carolina with more downpours last Sunday, cutting off the coastal city of Wilmington, damaging tens of thousands of homes and threatening worse flooding as rivers filled to the bursting point.

The death toll rose to at least 17.

Florence, a one time hurricane that weakened to a tropical depression by Sunday, dumped up to 100 cm of rain on parts of North Carolina since last week Thursday, and continued to produce widespread heavy rain over much of North Carolina and eastern South Carolina, the National Weather Service said.

"The storm has never been more dangerous than it is right now," North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper told a news conference. "Many rivers are still rising, and are not expected to crest until later today or tomorrow". Some rivers were not expected to crest until Monday or yesterday, the National Weather Service said. More than 900 people were rescued from rising floodwaters and 15 000 remained in shelters in the state, Cooper said. Many of those rescues took place on swift boats in Wilmington, a historic coastal city of about 117 000 people on a peninsula between the Cape Fear River and the Atlantic Ocean. More than 641 000 homes and businesses were without electricity in North and South Carolina and surrounding states, down



Florence death toll jumps to 31

CAROLINA - Rain-gorged rivers threatened further flooding on the storm-battered US East Coast on Monday as the death toll from Hurricane Florence, now a tropical depression, jumped to 31. Emergency management authorities in North Carolina said an earlier toll of 17 had risen to 25 since Florence made landfall on Friday as a Category 1 hurricane, with its aftermath threatening further flooding as well as potential dam failures and landslides. Six deaths have been confirmed in neighbouring South Carolina, with the latest being the driver of a pickup truck who drove into standing water in Lexington County.

Diver sues Elon Musk over comments

WASHINGTON - A British cave diver who helped in the dramatic rescue of 12 boys trapped in Thailand earlier this year sued Tesla founder Elon Musk on Monday for calling him a "pedo guy" and a "child rapist". The defamation suit filed in Los Angeles by Vernon Unsworth, a Briton involved in several cave rescues, follows a highly public spat between the two after Musk travelled to Thailand and offered to assist in rescue efforts. The dispute made headlines in July, when Unsworth called Musk's effort to build a mini-submarine for the rescue a "PR stunt" and Musk responded on Twitter by calling Unsworth a "pedo guy", or paedophile. AFP

Jailbreakers heading to Thailand

THAILAND - More than 30 inmates on the run after a Myanmar jailbreak may try to cross into Thailand, an official said on Monday, a day after they hijacked a garbage truck and ploughed through the prison gates. The fugitives broke out of Hpa-An jail in the country's eastern Karen state – which borders Thailand – on Sunday morning. State media said 10 of the 41 escapees had been recaptured while police are scouring nearby villages for those still at large. The jailbreak has left villagers near the prison scared, local official Khin Thet Mar told AFP.

Knife-wielding assailant shot

BRUSSELS - Belgian police shot and wounded a man who attacked one of the officers with a knife on Monday in a northern neighbourhood of the capital city, Brussels."The man attacked one of our colleagues with a knife, slightly wounding the officer on the head," said Brussels police spokesperson Ilse Van De Keere. Van De Keere said that a second officer shot the attacker and "seriously wounded him".

The spokesperson for the Brussels prosecutor's office, Ine Van Wymersch, said the incident did not appear to be terror related.

Child deaths cut by half

united nations - Six million children worldwide died last year from preventable diseases and other complications, which was about half the number of similar deaths in 2000 when nations endorsed goals to end extreme poverty, the United Nations said yesterday. World leaders adopted the UN's Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) in 2000, a year in which 11.2 million children below age 15 died from preventable diseases, a lack of clean water, malnutrition and during birth.

COCA-COLA LOOKING AT CANNABIS-INFUSED DRINKS

NEW YORK - Coca-Cola said on Monday it is studying the use of a key ingredient in marijuana in "wellness beverages," as a growing number of mainstream companies develop cannabis-infused drinks.

"We have no interest in marijuana or cannabis," Coca-Cola said in a statement. But the iconic soft drink producer is "closely watching the growth of non-psychoactive CBD (cannabidiol) as an ingredient in functional wellness beverages around the world."

Cannabidiol is a chemical in marijuana that does not have the intoxicating effects of THC, the major active ingredient that causes the "high". It has been used to treat epilepsy and other maladies.

"The space is evolving quickly," Coca-Cola said. "No decisions have been made at this time."

Coca-Cola's statement comes amid reports the company has held talks with Canada's Aurora Cannabis to develop beverages. Some of Coca-Cola's trademark cola products have struggled to grow sales in recent years due to health concerns.

Canada is set to legalise cannabis on October 17 after both houses of Parliament voted to make the drug available for recreational use.

That move has been seen as a potential prelude to further legalisation in the United States, even though recreational use of mari-



juana is still only permitted in a handful of states.

Beer giant Molson Coors announced on August 1 it was teaming up with Canadian medical marijuana grower The Hydropothecary Corporation to develop cannabis-infused nonalcoholic beverages.

Two weeks later, spirits company Constellation Brands announced a new \$4bn in investment in Canada's Canopy Growth in exchange for a 38 per cent stake in Canopy.

'Sex claim against Donald Trump, Supreme Court pick should be heard'

WASHINGTON - In light of accusations that Judge Brett Kavanaugh assaulted a woman, some have urged holding off on a vote that could see him become the top judge in the US.

The woman accusing US President Donald Trump's Supreme Court pick of sexual assault should be allowed to testify before a Senate committee, Trump's top female aide said on Monday.

Kellyanne Conway's comment came as the lawyer for the accuser, college Professor Christine Blasey Ford, said Ford is willing to testify publicly about the decades-old incident which she already described to The Washington Post.

The Senate Judiciary Committee is due to vote on the nomination of conservative Judge Brett Kavanaugh tomorrow, but in light of Ford's comments, a number of committee

members have urged holding off on a vote.

"She should be heard," Conway said on 'Fox and Friends'.

"This woman should not be insulted and she should not be ignored," said Conway, who added that Kavanaugh should also have an opportunity under oath to address Ford's allegations.

"He is a man of character and integrity who has been widely lauded by other women," she said.

The testimonies "would be added to the very considerable mountain of evidence and considerations that folks will have when they weigh whether or not to vote for Judge Kavanaugh to be on the Supreme Court."

But Conway said such testimony "should not unduly delay the vote." Asked on CNN whether Ford would be willing to testify publicly before the Judiciary Committee, her lawyer Debra Katz said: "The answer's yes." Lawmakers have not, however, made any such request for her testimony," the lawyer said.

21 killed in bus crash in central Iran

IRAN - At least 21 people died when a bus overturned following a collision with a tanker on a road in central Iran, Iranian media reported yesterday.

Iranian state television said the accident happened late on Monday on the road linking the cities of Kashan and Natanz, about some 250km southeast of the capital, Tehran.

The intercity bus was taking passengers from Tehran to the city of Kerman, some 1 000km to the southeast, when the accident took place.

Many Iranians are travelling this week as the four-day major Shiite Muslim holiday of Ashura gets underway. The TV said 20 people were injured in the crash and were taken to local hospitals. The survivors included two women and two boys under the age of six.

It broadcast footage showing the burning bus and tanker, flames rising into the nighttime sky as rescue teams rushed about at the site.

An unnamed survivor told the TV from his hospital bed that the crash happened close to midnight.

"The flames started at the front of the bus as diesel from the tanker poured in," he said, adding that he managed to escape through a bus window. With some 17 000 motorists killed annually, Iran has one of the world's worst traffic safety records, attributed mainly to widespread disregard for traffic laws, unsafe vehicles and inadequate emergency services. AP

Israeli PM gives 1 000 Ethiopians greenlight to immigrate

ISRAEL - Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu yesterday decided to allow 1 000 Ethiopians to immigrate to Israel, his office announced, in a rare intake of the Falashmura community.

The Falashmuras claim to be descendants of Ethiopian Jews, and they have long fought for the right to settle in Israel, even though the Jewish state does not recognise them as such. Israel – which took in tens of thousands of Jews from the African

nation in the 1980s and 1990s – considers that process to be complete. It also applies a restrictive immigration policy for non-Jews. But in 2015, the government established a nominative list of 9 000 Ethiopians who were allowed to immigrate to Israel within five years on the basis of family reunion.

Netanyahu said that since that decision, 1 300 Falashmuras had immigrated to Israel. "I am pleased to inform you that I have decided

that approximately 1 000 community members — whose children are already here — must be brought to Israel," Netanyahu said. Israel's Ethiopian community now numbers around 140 000 people, including more than 50 000 born in the Jewish state. Most of them are descendants of communities cut off from the Jewish world for centuries, and were belatedly recognised by Israeli religious authorities.





LAS VEGAS - Floyd Mayweather and Manny Pacquiao are in advanced talks over a money-spinning rematch in December, according to reports.

The two former pound-for-pound kings met in the richest fight in boxing history back in 2015, when after years of protracted talks Mayweather outpointed his rival in front of a record pay-per-view audience.

'Money' has since retired, hanging up his gloves after beating Conor McGregor last year. But RING Magazine claim the two fighters are closing in on another Las Vegas showdown, scheduled for later this year.

They claim that talks are in advanced stages and contracts are expected to be sent out this week.

Provided there are no hiccups in negotiations, the fight is likely to take place in Las Vegas on either December 1 or December 8.

The two rivals came face-to-face in

Japan earlier this month, where talk of a possible rematch first gathered pace.

"I'm coming back to fight Manny Pacquiao this year," said Mayweather. "Another nine-figure payday on the way."

Pacquiao, when quizzed on the potential rematch, said recently: "Mayweather? If he decides to go back to boxing then that is the time we are going to call the shots.

"I have the (WBA 'regular' welterweight) belt, so it's up to him. If he wants to come back in boxing, let's do a second one."

Mayweather won all 50 of his professional fights, picking up world titles in five weight classes and becoming the richest fighter in the sport's history.

Pacquiao, meanwhile, has triumphed in a record eight divisions but was beaten by Mayweather amid complaints of a shoulder injury.

Tiger's Ryder Cup return to cap amazing comeback season

WASHINGTON - Playing in the Ryder Cup will be the culmination of an amazing comeback season for Tiger Woods, one the 14time major champion feared might never happen after back surgery.

The 42-year-old American has shown flashes of the form that made him golf's dominant player in younger days in his first campaign after spinal fusion surgery, a lastgasp operation to try and extend his legendary career.

"It was a last-ditch effort," Woods said. "I tried everything else because fusion is the last-ditch effort and nothing beyond that. So didn't know what my playing career would be like. This is all uncharted territory." So far, Woods' performances are steadily improving and the medical charts are showing no back issues after years of nagging problems. Woods has hit drives longer than his youthful days, led the British Open in the final round in July, finished second in last month's PGA Championship and fired a 62 earlier this month, his lowest US PGA opening round since the 1999 Byron Nelson Classic.

And the former world number one achieved his goal of securing a Ryder Cup captain's pick from Jim Furyk, who pulled him from a planned assistant captain's role after seeing the quality of his game. "Deep down, I wanted to make the team. I really wanted to play on it," Woods said. "I had not started playing golf really yet, but still, it was a goal at the end of the season to make this team.

Traction

"As the year progressed, I gained some traction and was somehow able to get some high finishes and lo and behold, I'm a part of this team. It's incredible, it really is, to look back at the start of the year and to have accomplished a goal like that. To be a player is just beyond special." Woods still hasn't won a major since the 2008 US Open and hasn't won any event in more than five years, but has rediscovered the joy of playing after fears it might never happen again. "It's about enjoying being back," Woods said.

"Enjoying being able to play golf again. Competing at this level. All of these things at the beginning of the year were all unknowns. It has been one of my best years as a whole.

"To have a winless year, but to go through what I've gone through - I didn't know if I was ever going to play again, I was just hoping to be able to play with my children and golf with my buddies at home - this has been a blessing.

MOURINHO'S EURO WOES ADD TO PRESSURE ON MA

LONDON - Jose Mourinho is facing an unsettling new reality in the Champions League as Manchester United launch their campaign at Young Boys of Bern today.

Mourinho was once the Champions League's pre-eminent force, winning the tournament twice and making the latter stages virtually every

But it is four years since the Portuguese coach last managed a victory in the knockout stages of Europe's elite club competition.

In that time, the 55-year-old has been surpassed by Liverpool's Jurgen Klopp, Atletico Madrid's Diego Simeone and former Real Madrid boss Zinedine Zidane as the tournament's most innovative and successful coaches.

In Mourinho's past 10 knockout games with United and Chelsea in the Champions League he has just away victory in the knockout stages came at United's expense in 2013 when he was still at Real Madrid.

Mourinho's decline as a Champions League force mirrors the fading challenge of United, who reached three finals in four seasons from 2008 but have struggled to make an impact since.

the Premier League. Arteta said: "For me we have the best players in the world and I look at our players as if they are the best. I wouldn't change the players for any others. They are absolutely fantastic. FIFA CHIEF HAS DOUBTS ABOUT LIGA PLANS FOR US FIXTURE

ZURICH - FIFA President Gianni Infantino has expressed doubts about La Liga's plan to host Girona's home game against Barcelona in the United States.

The Spanish league wants the fixture to be played in Miami on January 26, 2019, but the president of soccer's world governing body is not keen on the idea.

"I think I would prefer to see a great MLS game in the US rather than La Liga being in the US," Infantino said in a statement provided by FIFA to ESPN on Monday. "In football, the gen-



eral principle is that you play a 'home' match at 'home', and not in a foreign country."

La Liga have asked the Spanish federation to approve the game being held overseas, while US Soccer, FIFA, UEFA and CONCACAF, which represents North and Central America and the Caribbean, must also agree for plans to go ahead.

FIFA told ESPN it had not yet been officially asked to give its consent for the game to be held in the US.

La Liga President Javier Tebas responded on Twitter to Infantino's disapproving comments.

"I will remind the president of FIFA that in the MLS, three teams from Canada play and Toronto FC are the current champions, and in Canada there is a professional league," wrote Tebas.

LONDON - Arsenal Chief Executive Ivan Gazidis is to leave the club to take up a similar post at Italian giants AC Milan, the Premier League club announced yesterday.

Speculation that Gazidis – who oversaw Unai Emery's appointment to replace Arsene Wenger in May – will depart for Italy has been rife for some time.

Now the move has been confirmed, with Raul Sanllehi, currently Head of Football Relations at the Emirates Stadium, to become head of football when Gazidis heads to Milan.

Arsenal's Chief Commercial Officer Vinai Venkatesham will take over the role of managing director at the same point.

Gazidis, 54, has reportedly been offered £3.6 million (\$4.7 million) a year – a £1 million increase in his present salary – and an equity stake in the AC Milan by the American owners Elliott Management, who took over in July. Gazidis, who will leave Arsenal by the end of October, has worked for the Gunners since 2009 and has been behind a radical change in management structure at the Emirates.

He played a major part in introducing roles such as Sanllehi's, as well as that of head of recruitment—a post held by Sven Mislintat.

Those appointments wrestled some power away from Wenger, whose 22-year tenure came to a close at the end of last season. Gazidis wrote a lengthy message to Arsenal supporters, in which he described his impending move as the "hardest decision of my life"

There have been significant changes behind the scenes at Arsenal in recent months, with majority shareholder Stan Kroenke last month launching a bid to take overall control of the club through his company Kroenke Sports and Entertainment (KSE).

D'Or." Atletico Madrid host the final of this season's Champions League and Ramos also grinned: "Playing the final at the Wanda Metropolitano is always going to give us a bit of extra motivation." He was absent from the final three with Cristiano Ronaldo, Luka Modric and Mohamed Sala all contesting the prize. In an interview with Diario AS this week he said: "It's a FIFA prize and it is a shame that no World Cup winner is nominated. "I think the Balon d'Or carries more prestige and more history. "I have it in my head and there are three months for me to give everything [to win it]."

SPAIN TAXMAN DROPS ACCUSATIONS AGAINST RODRIGUEZ

MADRID - Spain's taxman has dropped accusations that Colombia's James Rodriguez evaded millions of euros in taxes when he played at Real Madrid, the El Mundo daily reported yesterday.

The newspaper revealed in July that tax authorities accused the Bayern Munich midfielder of having evaded 6.35 million euros (\$7.4 million) in taxes and would have

to pay that amount plus a fine and interests for a total of 11.65 million

They reportedly said James was transferred to Real Madrid from Monaco for 80 million euros mid-2014, but that he registered as a non-resident that year and should have registered as a resident.

But the 27-year-old's lawyers, according to El Mundo, submitted new documents that saw tax author-

ities drop their accusations.

They are still demanding he pay four million euros for "a technical difference in criteria" in his tax

Tax authorities refused to confirm the information when contacted by AFP. A lot of players have fallen foul of Spanish tax authorities in recent years. Some have reached deals, like Cristiano Ronaldo, who accepted to pay 18.8 million euros and receive a two-year jail sentence he won't have to serve.

Spanish tax authorities eventually reduced the amount he had to pay to 16.7 million euros, El Mundo reported. FC Barcelona's star Lionel Messi, though, went to court where he was fined 2.1 million euros for tax fraud and given 21 months in jail, which was subsequently converted into another fine.

EVER CONTROVERSIAL MARADONA AKES WINNING DEBUT IN MEXICO

MEXICO - Controversial and combative as ever, Diego Maradona made his Mexican coaching debut on Monday with a 4-1 win for his new club, the second-division side Dorados.

It could hardly have been otherwise in the country that saw the Argentine legend score his infamous 'hand of God' goal as he led his country to the 1986 World Cup title.

Alternately grinning and defensive, Maradona thumbed his nose at his critics after Ecuadoran forward Vinicio Angulo scored a hat-trick to give Dorados the win over Cafeteleros of Tapachula. "Some people said Maradona's useless.

There were a lot of stupid people going on television to fill up the time," Maradona told a packed post-match press conference in Culiacan, Sinaloa, his new club's home base.

"I hope they'll come to the pitch now and look at my record and see what we're actually doing, see that I know how to do this.'

Maradona, 57, vowed it was just the beginning for the struggling club, who leapt from 13th place in their 15-team

"I'm not expecting much. Maradona has never shown himself to be a good coach. I think there are better coaches than him in Mexico," said Kevin Juarez, a 26-year-old fan, ahead of the match.

"The one good thing is that Maradona's arrival has drawn the world's attention to Dorados," he told AFP.

"I really enjoyed playing with him because he made me better on the pitch and he's a great guy off it, too. I gave him loads of assists and he doesn't need me to remind him of that!

"It was easy to play with him because you didn't need to create a lot of chances. Even if I just gave him two passes, he would score two goals and that's why he's one of the greatest footballers who's ever lived." Kick-Off

AmaZulu feel brunt in PSL's disciplinary double standards

JOHANNESBURG - Double standards that have emerged in the PSL's handling of disciplinary matters escalated headlong to new heights last week with the severe sentencing of AmaZulu over crowd misbehaviour at their game against Marnelodi Sundowns at the King Zwelithini Stadium.

It can be argued, the fine of R640 000, with R320 000 suspended, heaped on the KwaZulu-Natal club is in accordance with a refreshing tough line in dealing with crowd violence.

But taken in conjunction with the fine of R250 000, with R200 000 suspended, meted out to Kaizer Chiefs for a similar offence by their supporters, makes AmaZulu's indignation regarding the discrepancies in sentencing quite understandable.

In a nutshell, what the diverse PSL disciplinary decisions entails is for AmaZulu to immediately pay an amount of R320 000 in comparison with the relatively modest R50 000 that was required by Chiefs.

In addition, when Chiefs pleaded guilty to a second outbreak of violence by their supporters at the Nedbank Cup semi-final against Free State Stars at the Moses Mabhida Stadium in Durban and sentenced to play two games behind closed doors, the previous R200 000 fine was benevolently not implemented on the lame basis that the PSL itself was in charge of security at the Moses Mabhida Stadium - even though the prime indictment again concerned violence that, in this instance, reached some of the most serious to manifest itself in South African soccer in recent years.

A security guard was critically beaten at the Durban game, at least 14 others badly injured, with damage to the stadium and TV equipment running into millions.

In the circumstances, it came as no surprise on Monday when AmaZulu spokesperson Brilliant Mkhathini confirmed the club intend taking the matter of their fine on appeal.

But more disturbing, perhaps, is the overall trend of the PSL hierarchy favouring some clubs over others with whom they have a close allegiance.



According to the MTN Premier League rules, each club is required to pay E25 000 to cover the allowances of referees and match commissioners while it is E20 000 for the National First






