In the statement, Simelane said the trip was successful and the premier was responding positively to treatment.


"He has responded more positively to the treatment of his team of doctors. On return, the prime minister paid tribute to Their Majesties for blessing his departure to undergo routine medical

STUDY LOANS: LETTERS MAND OUT JUNE 1

BENEFICIARIES of the government of Eswatini study loans who have not yet made repayment arrangements will be served with letters of demand come

Project Manager Khanya Magagula revealed that at the beginning of June 1, the study loans consortium will be sending out letters of demand to beneficiaries who have failed to come forward to make repayment arrangements.

"The consortium has already identified beneficiaries who are failing to come to make the appropriate arrangements and come June 1, we will serve them with the necessary legal documents," he said. Magagula said the consortium has to this end, done all possible means to have Fmaswati who benefitted from the initrive voluntarily come forward but some have chosen to ignore all the pleas.

He explained that the letters of demand will be giving the defiant beneficiaries a specific time frame to present themselves before the consortium to make repayment arrangements before their cases are escalated to the government's attorney for legal action.

"The letters of demand are like a final warning shot to the beneficiaries who have been failing for various reasons to come present themselves and make repayment arrangements. Individuals who have not come through should utilise the period between now and May 31, to avoid legal steps being taken against them. This is a serious offence and beneficiaries should understand it," he said.

eficiaries have been approached at their places of work, where with the help of employers they were notified about their obligation of repaying the study loans, but still some could not be bothered.

"It is only fair to those who adhered to our calls that we proceed with the litigation stage.

"After all, the consortium has been to all the country's regional towns to try to get closer to the people. We have also had three deadlines still trying to get beneficiaries to come and make repayment arrangement and some have not bothered themselves about doing the right thing,"

The project manager highlighted that the consortium is faced with challenges where certain beneficiaries have come up with all sorts of theories about the project and are purposely refusing to cooperate.

He said these some beneficiaries say they will only start making the repayments once they are convinced that the funds go straight to funding students who are pursuing higher education.

"This is a wrong way of doing things because this means these beneficiaries can afford to repay the study loans but they just don't want to. The fact of matter is that the government gave you a study loan and you must honour the agreement and repay the loan so that other students may be afforded the same opportunity as you and receive higher education as you

Ex-Minister's corruption trial now set for September

FORMER Justice and Constitutional Affairs Minister Senator Sibusiso Shongwe's corruption trial has now been set for September.

Yesterday High Court Judge Mbutfo Mamba allocated the trial date to September 25, 2018 as he met both the crown and defence attorneys in his chambers.

Representing Shongwe in the matter is senior attorney Lucky Howe while the crown is represented by Principal Crown Counsel Thabo Dlamini. Shongwe is charged with contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006.

The trial had been initially set for March 5, before Judge Mamba and the last time he appeared before court, the matter was allocated 10

Shongwe's case is amongst those that are expected to be finalised before the close of the last session of the High Court.

The matter has been postponed at least three times now as initial-

ly, the former minister, now senator, had his trial dates allocated by High Court which were August 7, 2017, and the last date which had been allocated was August 17, 2017, but the matter was postponed to the first session of the High Court this year which was March 5, 2018.

The former minister was in 2014 arrested in connection to E2 million that was found in his law firm's trust account, which he allegedly failed to disclose its source when requested to do so by ACC

Investigators.
His law firm practices under the style Sibusiso B Shongwe and Associates and is based in Mbabane.

Already there has been a pre-trial conference for the legislator and the crown is expected to parade its witnesses. Corruption related cases are being expedited by the courts following the appointment of more Judges of the High Court and that the subsequent appointment of a permanent full bench of Judges of the Supreme Court.

Already the E50 million case has been concluded with three convicted and sentenced to 10 and four years respectively.

The importance of proper referencing

MAN GRABS GIRL (5) FROM MOTHER, RAPES HER

WHILE senators are engaged in petty politics with regards the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill debate, young girls and women continue to be brutally violated physically and sexually.

The Bill aims to protect women from sexual and physical abuse but disturbingly, it has stalled in Senate after it was approved by the House of Assembly. Semantics appear to be the delaying factor of the Bill being passed.

As the legislators run in circles, a life of a young girl aged five will never be the same after she was grabbed from

her mother before being dragged into a bush by a monster that sexually violated her.

The petrifying incident happened on Monday around Mahlalini, an area in the outskirts of Nhlangano.

The toddler was accompanying her mother to a neighbour's homestead when the man emerged from a thick-

He grabbed the child and disappeared with her in the thicket where he sexually violated her.

Information gathered is that it was around 4pm when the mother took a walk to a neighbour's home with her five-year-old daughter. The young girl walked a couple of steps ahead of her mother who was carrying another child.

Community members suspect that the heartless man could be one of the gangs that abuse drugs, in particular dagga.

Cellphone

According to the girl's mother who cannot be mentioned to protect the violated child, they were going to fetch a



cellphone from the neighbour's homestead they had taken for charg-

"We were going to fetch a cellphone from the neighgbour's homestead where we always take it for charging.

"It is not far away from our home but because the pathway is surrounded by shrubs and bushy vegetation, it's not easy to see the one you are following and in the case of my daughter, she walked in the front and just vanished from my eyes. At first I just thought she had proceeded straight to the homestead without assuming anything strange could have befallen her," she narrated.

The saddened mother said in that maze she heard her daughter scream but could not locate where the screams came from.

She said her attempts to call out her daughter's name did not work as there was no response.

She said for a moment she lost her mind and while she contemplated her next move, a stranger emerged from the thicket with her teary daughter in tow.

"There she was with the stranger emerging from the bush. I did not hesitate as I personally confronted the man and just when I got hold of him, he slipped and was swallowed by the bush again," she said.

The mother said her shaken daughter bore all the signs of a person who had been sexually violated.

She quickly checked on her and

her fears were confirmed, her daugh ter had been raped.

The terrified mother raised an alarm that community members responded to promptly and combed the forest in search of the monster with the hope that he was still in the vicinity.

Caught

Indeed, he was spotted and just when the residents thought they had caught him, he slipped again leaving his bewildered captors holding his stinky jacket.

The mother said police were alerted but the excuse they gave was that there was no vehicle at the police station as they were all assigned to the ongoing elections registration process.

She said it was then that an ambulance from 977 arrived and the child was rushed to hospital.

"Doctors examined her and found that indeed there was penetration but it was not that deep.

"She was given medication that has to do with infection and pain. I am still terrified and scared for my daughter's safety even now. It's a trauma that would haunt her for a long time as she was also threatened with death when she screamed for help," said the moth-

Moi Moi: A husband will never rape his wife

CLAUSE 151 of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill continued to be a hot topic yesterday during the deputy prime minister's office Senate portfolio committee debate of the proposed legislation.

The clause which reads "marital or other relationship, previous or existing, shall not provide a defence to any offence under this Act" sparked a hot debate in the upper chamber.

There were senators who were of the view that the clause should be removed completely from the Bill. These senators argued that rape did not exist in marriage, hence this clause belittled the institution of marriage and if this clause was left in the Bill that would eventually be enacted into an Act, could create confusion and also break marriages.

Senator Moi Moi Masilela said from where he was standing the clause had to be removed.

He said the sole purpose of marriage was to engage in sexual intercourse whenever one felt like.

He said women during sexual intercourse initiation or foreplay had the tendency of not giving in easily and they would do that after a lot of begging and convincing.

left as it is, many married men would find themselves behind bars.

"Generally women do not give in easily nor do they initiate sexual intercourse, we men initiate and further convince women by begging and touching them in the right places to engage in sexual intercourse with us. I worry that this clause will allow women to run to report their husbands accusing them of rape every chance they get when that wasn't exactly what had happened. Women that say husbands rape them are those that don't want to submit to husbands. While making laws we must be cognisant of our customs as Emaswati. This clause suits people who are married through civil rites because divorce exists in the white context. White people long accepted that people can fall out of love, something that our culture does not recognise hence there is no divorce in our culture," he said.

Senator Lindiwe Ngwenya, on the other hand, disagreed with Masilela.

She said the clause was necessary to protect women against their husbands who didn't understand that a wife had a right to say no to sexual intercourse. She said a woman was not a sex machine, therefore, there were times when she didn't feel like it. She further said the senators' attitude towards the clause was worrying.

The attitude of fellow senators is He was worried that if the Bill was worrying. I am tempted to think that

you are animals at home," she said.

These remarks didn't sit well with the male senators and Senator Themba Ginindza, who was sitting in front of Ngwenya, was heard saying; "Our wives aren't like you."

Senator Princess Phumelele asked that the clause be revisited.

Seeing that the clause was rubbing the senators the wrong way, Chairperson of the committee Senator Lungile Gama suggested that the senators skip it.

"Can I suggest honourable senators that we skip this clause; we will come back to it together with the others (clauses) that we skipped at a later date," she said.

Senator Prince Fipha, who since the beginning of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill debate argued that the definition of rape was very shallow, yesterday pointed this out.

Making his point, the senator said in the Bill rape was defined as an unlawful act with a person and, therefore, this couldn't take place in a marriage because this was a lawful commitment between two people.

How do men prove they were raped? - Prince

"WHILE women can see a medical practitioner to prove that there was forced penetration in their private parts how do men prove that they were forced to engage in sexual activities?"

This was a question posed by Senator Prince Kekela yesterday in Parliament during the portfolio committee debate of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Bill

Prince Kekela said women were not the only ones who were victims of rape but men were raped too by other men and women.

He said there had been cases of raped

men reported in the media.

"I understand that women would go to medical practitioners to prove that there was forced penetration. What happens when a men is raped? How does he prove it to the police that he had been raped?" he asked.

Revisited

He advised that this must be revisited because it was giving the idea that men cannot be raped when in actual fact they could.

He further said the law needed to protect men from women who used rape' to punish men.

"Some men are in jail for rape but asked.

when you follow the case they didn't rape these women as it was consensual but out of spite the women reported them for rape," he said.

Senator Bonisile Mngomezulu concurred with him, narrating that in her time while serving as a wardress at His Majesty's Correctional Services. a man was remanded for allegedly raping his ex-girlfriend but was acquitted a year later when it finally came out that the woman had lied.

"What happens when a woman out of spite reports a man for rape when in actual fact she had consented?" she

A child was found dumped in a dustbin yesterday evening in one of the streets of Mbabane.

The child, who looked a few days old, was found wrapped in a black refuse bag and thrown into a dustbin at the traffic circle along Gwamile Street.

The child was found by a young man estimated to be in his 20s. The young man, who did not want to reveal his name, said he heard a sound of a crying child coming from the dustbin. The child was found at about 7pm.


"I was walking past the traffic circle when I heard the sound of a crying baby coming from the dustbin. I could not believe it at first, but upon hearing the sound, I went to find out what it was because I could not think it could be a child. I thought it was a cat maybe," he said. He further stated that upon opening the black plastic bag, he was shocked to find that it was a child.

He then took the child and gave it to security guards from 4Him Security Services, who are stationed at the Municipal Council of Mbabane.

Personnel from the Emergency Medical Services (popularly known as paramedics) were called to take the child to asspital for further examination.

Police were also called to record some statements on the incident. They had not arrived at the time of compiling this report.

Central Bank GM takes Majozi to court over DC

Stories by Sandile Nkambule Industrial Court

A general manager (GM) of financial regulation at Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) has taken the Governor Majozi Sithole to court where he is challenging the governor's decision to take him to a disciplinary hearing.

Mbongiseni Nkambule is also seeking an order that the governor, deputy governor and assistant attend and file a report on how the concerns he raised have been addressed as per the Executive Committee resolution of March 27, 2018.

Further, he is seeking an order that his suspension from work be declared unlawful and declaring the governor's action or conduct of preferring charges against him as *ultra vires* premature and should be quashed and set aside.

Initially, Nkambule lodged an appeal at the Industrial Court of Appeal after the Industrial Court held that it does not have jurisdiction to hear and adjudicate over the application brought by him, stating that the chairperson of the disciplinary hearing can issue declaratory orders.

He has now brought the application which was yesterday before Industrial Court Judge Abande Dlamini.

He stated that he also expunged the minutes attached to his affidavit without notice as contemplated by the rule of court and in so doing, the court struck

out all the contents leaving the application at a disadvantage.

He submitted that the application is urgent and it cannot be afforded redress in due processes based on reasons that stopping the respondent from proceeding with the disciplinary enquiry such that his appeal may become academic because its purpose is to uphold the position that a chairperson of a hearing cannot issue declaratory orders as he only recommends unless a disci-

plinary code or any other policy stipulates otherwise.

He submitted that the appeal may be overtaken by events if the disciplinary action which he complains of its unlawfulness is allowed to proceed.

He stated that there is no way redress can be obtained at this stage save for waiting for the adjudication of the matter at appeal and further stated that the respondent has made additional charges on the basis that he attached minutes of the Executive Committee on the initial legal proceedings as though he has published same which shows that the governor is all out on him.

He submitted that there is nowhere a person can be denied his right to approach a court of law in seeking redress, arguing that in the advent of the constitutional dispensation, courts should be slow to tolerate and entertain the old notion of the absolute power of disciplinary at the workplace, adding that there must be checks and balances.

"I submit that I have a clear right to prosecute this action which right is sourced from Section 19 (4) of the Industrial Relations Act and the relief sought herein will protect my right against being subjected to gross unfair labour practice which gave rise to the dismissed application," Nkambule submitted.

He stated that there was no other alternative remedy obtainable elsewhere besides the honourable court, adding that he may suffer irreparable harm if the stay of the disciplinary hearing is

Chairperson has requisite jurisdiction for declaratory orders- Central Bank

ACCORDING to the Central Bank of Swaziland, the chairperson of the Disciplinary tribunal has the requisite jurisdiction to make declaratory orders.

According to Bonsiwe Masuku, who is the General Manager Corporate Services, the primary relief sought by the applicant was an interdict and the application fell short of peremptory requirements.

With respect to the question as to whether a chairperson can declare a particular procedure or institution of disciplinary charges unlawful, the court was correct that the chairperson has the requisite jurisdiction.

She submitted that the crisp issue in the present application is the absence of prospects of success on appeal and the absence of irreparable harm and the notion of injustice.

Masuku stated that the applicant can appear before the chairman of the disciplinary hearing and make representations, including on the issues he has indicated he wishes to challenge and should the chairman dismiss those objections and in circumstances where he commits a renewable

not granted as he may be subjected to proceedings which he is questioning its legality.

He submitted that the balance of convenience favours that the

irregularity, then the applicant has a competent remedy of approaching the Industrial Court, highlighting that the court cannot usurp the functions and powers of an employer to institute discipline.

Masuku denied that the applicant can suffer irreparable harm and prejudice, arguing that he is required to demonstrate in terms of the law the potentiality of irreparable harm or prejudice if the application for stay is not granted.

The mere contention that the appeal would become academic does not address the question of the irreparability of harm and the right of appeal is not disputed, however, it is not the mere exercise of the right that warrants the grant of a stay," Masuku submitted. She submitted that the applicant can appear before the disciplinary enquiry and request for a postponement pending finalisation of the present matter before court, adding that the chairperson of the hearing who is seized with the matter has the requisite jurisdiction to grant or refuse such a request for postponement.

SWAZI Mobile on Tuesday night hosted different company executives in a bid to update them on the services the company is offering.


Making the presentation, Sales Manager Benedict Bennett said the company was wanted to give its clients a first world experience. Bennett informed the executives of the recently launched

FINANCE BILL COMPROMISES HUMAN RIGHTS - SA CONSULTANT

THE Finance Bill of 2018 compromises basic human rights causing corporate tax dodging that drives extreme inequality, making the rich richer and the poor poorer.

South African Amnesty International Consultant, Thembinkosi Dlamini said this during the Consultative Dialogue of the Finance Bill hosted by the Coordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations (CANGO) in collaboration with the Catholic Commission for Justice and Peace at Sibane Hotel yesterday.

The consultant said corporate tax dodging is caused by political capture, revolving door of influence whereby governments let big business rig tax rules in their favour.

Dlamini mentioned that citizens have an obligation to pay taxes but also a right to know, influence and benefit from how their money is being spent. He said over-charging for civic services as proposed in the Finance Bill of 2018 might be counterproductive and lead to the Kingdom sliding backwards in a number of key social indicators.

He added that state legitimacy and effectiveness, including wise budget planning and expenditure, strongly influences citizens' willingness to pay taxes. "Public budgets are a central tool to the planning realisation and evaluation of human rights policies," he said. Furthermore, he highlighted that public budget enable the progressive fulfillment of human rights. Government has the obligation to maximise resources to achieve the realisation of their human rights commitments.

"Unfair tax systems undermine human rights principles of equality and non-discrimination," he said.

Tax haven governments facilitate tax avoidance and evasion depriving the people and governments of other countries of the revenue they used to

deliver on their human rights commitments. Moreover, the consultant jogged memories, saying the Kingdom of Eswatini scored poorly in the 2017-Open Budget Survey, the world's only independent, comparative assessment of the three pillars of public budget accountability; transparency, oversight and public participation.

"Eswatini seems to have missed most of the targets it self in the 2013-2018 development unusual programme of action," he said.

Meanwhile, Dlamini shared possible solutions that can be considered, saying having the potential to reduce or reinforce social and gender inequality by redistributing wealth and income, reflect governments' social and economic policy priorities.

Dlamini said the government of Eswatini needs to stop rigged rules that allow a race to the bottom and companies to benefit at the expense of the poorest people. "The government needs to also support calls for an intergovernmental body for tax cooperation like some of a World Tax Authority where all countries have an equal say," he suggested.

"It should also be agreed to increase tax cooperation, capacity development and end tax competition between countries and also create a roadmap towards a fairer future tax system which could include steps to ensuring that companies pay tax where economic value is created and see an eradicating tax havens."

He moved on saying fair taxation, international aid budgets under threat and with the risk that government debt will become unsustainable in many countries.

"Increasing the capacity of tax authorities, ensuring tax systems are progressive and clamping down on illicit financial flows could all yield significant amounts.'

Lastly, Dlamini mentioned beneficial ownership as the real person who ultimately owns, controls or benefits from a company or trust fund and the income it generates (Transparency International).

'Overtaxing, humiliating the poor, not God's purpose'

OVERTAXING of the poor and humiliating them against the rich is never God's purpose for mankind, which is the inclusivity of his people in all spheres of life and even in finances of their

This is according to Council of Swaziland Churches' Human Rights and Advocacy Officer, Vusi Kunene during the consultative Dialogue on the Finance Bill

Kunene said taxes are supposed to help balance the difference between the have and the have-not so that even the havenot should enjoy living and that is why the scripture says the church is made of different parts. "Why are so many taxes

that are going to affect the poor introduced?" he posed.

The advocacy officer continued asking whether in that way the poor are not made more poor instead of lifting them up. "If the taxes or the service fees are going to cripple the poor then the govemment is failing in bringing about God's purpose for mankind.

Poverty in the midst of those who have, takes away the dignity of a human being," he mentioned.

Kunene clarified saying the church is not against the paying of taxes because Jesus himself commanded people to pay taxes and Jesus forfeited taxes.

"Give Ceasar what belongs to Ceasar,"

Moreover, Kunene said the church is the prophetic voice of the state and therefore should speak to those who are overtaxing the people and must hold the people's hand as they cry about taxes.

"The church cannot pray alone and think that is enough without action, which includes voicing the cry of the poor on taxes," he said.

Meanwhile, Kunene explicated reiterating a plea to those in power, saying it is not that people should not be made to pay taxes but the overtaxing is the problem. "May the Almighty God forgive us for failing to hold the hands of the needy and walk with them," he concluded.

Finance Bill policies not clear - FSE & CC

THE Finance Bill of 2018 is not clear on its policies and its targets.

This was said by Federation of Swaziland Employers and Chamber of Commerce's Trade and Business Support Coordinator, Musa Maseko during the consultative dialogue on the Finance Bill of 2018.

The Bill is not thoroughly analysed on some policies on saving for ordinary consumers. "Are we promoting saving or are we just focused on increasing the country's economy," wondered Maseko.

He said the Kingdom of Eswatini needs to have a public panel discussion on the finances of country where the public can have the leverage to voice out their concerns. "Eswatini needs to engage in serious and urgent policy and legislative reforms-including the outstanding review of the Public Finance Management Act," he said.

Maseko said a mismatch between government revenues and expenditure now and in the forcible future is avoidable at times.

He went on to say over optimistic revenue projections on account of anticipated policy reforms, what exactly does it mean?

He moved on saying a huge budget deficit that requires financing either domestic or foreign debt, spurs inflation is a tax on the poor.

2-MONTH-OLD BABY LEFT ALONE IN HOUSE FOR WHOLE NIGHT, DIES

...mother arrested and charged under the Child Protection Act.

A 36-year-old woman of Mbikwakhe has been arrested after she left a twomonth-old baby alone in a house for a whole night, resulting to the death of the infant.

Thandaza Nokwethu Matse was arrested by Sgodvweni police and she appeared at the Matsapha Circuit Court before Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini yesterday. She was charged with contravening the Child Protection Act of 2012.

During her court appearance, her rights to legal representation were read and the accused elected to conduct her own defence.

According to the court record, it is said the accused is charged with contravening Section 48 (1) of The Children Protection and Welfare Act 6/2012 in that on 20 May, while at Mbikwakhe, the accused person abandoned her minor child Lindo*, a two-month-old baby alone inside a house the whole night without making provision for supervision and care for the child, who was then found dead.

The accused was not made to enter a plea on the charges levelled against her as the prosecutor Fakazi Mngomezulu made an application that she be remanded into police custody pending committal to the High Court.

Normally people who are charged

with neglecting their babies are tried by the magistrate and can also make bail application at the Magistrate's Courts, however, in this instance the prosecutor informed the accused that should she want to apply for bail she must do so at the High Court.

Charge

The prosecutor said the reason was because the charge might be amended as the court was still trying to ascertain if the death of the child could be attributed to the abandonment by her parent who left her alone for the whole night.

The accused was then remanded into police custody pending her next court appearance next Wednesday at the Matsapha Circuit Court.

Boy (16) stabs younger brother (13) in fight over school socks

A family of Msumphe is struggling to come to terms with a case of a minor (13) who was stabbed by his own brother (16).

It has been said the stabbing, although only skin deep, could have been much worse if the mother of the two boys had not involved herself during the very heated fight. The incident happened yesterday morning at a homestead located past Msumphe.

Sources revealed that both brothers had consumed some dagga popcoms with their friends the night before the fight. The names of both the minors have been withheld for ethical reasons. Interviewedby this publication yesterday afternoon, well-placed sources said the dagga was still in the boys'system when the fight occurred.

"The information we currently have is that the boys started to fight over school socks; an argument which then got heated due to the fact that the father at the homestead had already departed early for work. During the fight, the younger brother produced a pocket knife that was

quickly dispatched to the floor by the older brother," he said.

The fight then went on resulting in the older brother picking up the knife and eventually stabbing his younger brother in the stomach.

At this point, the mother barged into the room and separated the fighting sons. The injured brother was then rushed to the Pigg's Peak Government Hospital by his mother and the young man received two stitches," added the source.

When approached for comment at the hospital, the boys' mother told. this publication that she did not want to report the matter to the police.

She also preferred that it was not reported by the media. Pigg's Perk police later said the matter was not reported. The source said both boys needed counselling because this could impact in their lives in future.

"The young men needed some counselling to avoid this type of violence, especially if it is suspected that they s moke dagga at their tender age." Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Khulani Mamba confirmed that the matter had not been reported to the police at the time of compiling this story.



Selling dagga keeps me away from serious crimes - Accused

AN accused person, who was arrested for possession of dagga, left the court stunned when he stated that selling the illegal herb kept him away from committing more serious crimes.

Mlandvo Ndzinisa (34) was appearing before Senior Magistrate Donald Mavuso, where he faced a charge of contravening the Opium Act. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully possessed dagga weighing 1.58 kilograms.

When the charge sheet was read to him, the accused person pleaded guilty. His plea was subsequently accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence. During mitigation, the accused first asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, saying he was unemployed. He stated that he intended to sell the dagga so that he could get some money to bring food on the table for his family.

The accused person said he resolved to sell-

ing dagga after failing to get employment for the past years. He said he was aware that this was against the law, but it was the only thing that kept him away from committing serious crimes. Court records indicate that the accused person is fresh from serving six years in a correctional facility for a string of house breaking and theft charges.

This is the least I could do to survive, or wise I could have committed more serious crimes," he said, much to the amusement of the people who were in the gallery.

Meanwhile, the accused further informed the court that police assaulted him during the arrest. He alleged that the police believed he had more dagga in his house, but they eventually failed to get it.

When issuing judgment, the senior magistrate advised the accused person to first work on getting a licence permitting him to seller dagga.

Mavuso said in the meantimession of dagga remained one of the serie crimes in the country. Ndzinisa was eventually sentenced to five months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E1 500 fine.

Tertiary institutions to get allowances month

IN a quest to curb violence at universities caused by delay of allowances, the ministry of labour and social security has assured tertiary institutions that they will be getting their allowances before the end of the month.

Students in most tertiary institutions have over the years opted for boycotting classes and engagwhich most often results to closure of the insti-

Principal Secretary in the Ministry of Labour and Social Security Mkhaliphi said since yesterday, some of the students had already been given their allowances while others will be getting them in the course of the month.

"We are hoping that by May 31 all the tertiary institutions will be sorted with their allowances so as to avoid the class boycotts

ing in violence when their allowances are delayed and violence's that crupt as a result of the delay in allowances," he said.

This assurance from the ministry came after complaints by some students from Limkokwing University of Creative Technology (LUCT) who claimed their allowances were due February but they have not yet received them.

They claim to have been handed a memo instead, that calls for them to provide particulars for purposes of upgrading study loan disbursement processes through filling a form.

Student Representative Council President at LUCT Benele Simelane said they did get the assurance from the ministry that they would be given their allowances this month and they were expecting it.

Meanwhile, the school's SRC, which is facing suspension for allegedly perpetrating a class boycott in March, went to a disciplinary hearing and they are awaiting the verdict as revealed by Simelane.

'Quorum issues can be sorted by women'

THE thorny issue of failing to form a quorum by MPs can be sorted by the presence of women in Parliament, MP Thuli Dladla said in the House of Assembly.

She was speaking on the importance of women involvement in Parliament. Dladla said women v ere diligent in their work and were very good helpers.

Dladla said MPs who would come from the same Inkhundla with the women would find it easy to work towards developing their Inkhundla. She urged MPs to ensure that the women Bill is passed so that everyone could benefit.

The involvement of women, according to Dladla, would ensure unprecedented progress in terms of representation, legislation and oversight.

"The quorum issues that are now a problem in this House can be sorted by the presence of women. Look at this from what I am doing. I am always in this House from start to finish," Dladla said.

Dladla was supported by MP Princess Ncengencenge, who also supported the Bill because many African countries had already adopted this practice. Eswatini would find it difficult to work if it did not adopt the practice.

Manzini North MP Jan Sithole said people should not take women for granted because they could do a lot for the country, if they were given the opportunity.

He then stated that women were originally made to become helpers of men because it was discovered that men's lives were miserable without the presence of women.

It would be a mistake to think of women as people who were not capable of doing something because they were helpers.

SHOULD NLY NOMINATED

NOMINATED women should be considered for elections only if the electorate did not elect 30 per cent of women to be in Parliament.

This was a view expressed by Mkhiweni MP Gideon Dlamini, who said such nominated women would be able to work diligently and with respect. He said the individuals who never had the experience of campaigning for elections and being elected have in the past proven to be a problem because they never worked in cooperation.

Cooperation, according to MP Gideon, was the comerstone of the Tinkhundla system of governance. If people did not want to cooperate, they were working against the system.

The MP said in his constituency, people would just go and talk to certain organisations, without involving the MP, yet the MP was the one who had to sign for the organisations to be funded by government.

This was done by politicians who were never elected, some of whom were ministers. However, MP Princess Neengeneenge had a problem with the nomination prerequisite for women. She said this could prove to be a challenge for women because it was difficult to nominate women at

chiefdom level. Most women were married and had husbands.

This was a challenge because a man would sometimes not be happy when his wife was nominated by another man. Hosea MP Thulani Masuku also posed concerns regarding the nomination stating that it was a problem because it needed 10 supporters for the nominated pron to be considered for pri vary elections

Finance Bill ready to be debated

According to sources close to the matter, the distribution exercise would be undertaken during meetings which would be disguised as empowerment meetings for farm-

Residents who are against the cultivation of dagga in the area are said to have viewed this as an act which could perpetrate moral decay in the area.

Handful

A handful of residents who were interviewed on the matter confirmed knowing the said aspiring politician only as a person who has suddenly grown to be known for making random distribution of freebies.

"I happened to experience one of that person's distributions where she, distributed two cases of beer to a group of youth who were from playing football at a nearby sports ground," said a resident who claimed to have been part of the group.

He described the aspiring candidate as someone who had a good heart and always assisted mainly the youth in various spheres.

A senior member of the inner council who only wanted to be identified as Maziya also confirmed having received complaints to this effect.

Maziya said they have received an informal complaint from some residents about the aspiring politician's behaviour.

"The matter has not yet been discussed by the umphakatsi since some of us have been of the view that this could be a decampaigning stunt designed by other potential candidates,'

In the meantime, efforts to get a comment from Indvuna of the umphakatsi Moris Mbuli were unsuccessful as his mobile phone was not available on the MTN network.

Residents take Chief Mashampu to court



FORMER Secretary General of the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) Musa Dlamini, together with other residents of Ezulwini, have taken Chief Mashampu Khumalo and Micro Projects Coordinating Unit to court, where they are seeking an order interdicting and restraining the two from constructing a community hall in the area.

Dlamini of Ezulwini, who is also an Industrial Court assessor together with the other residents, are also seeking an order that a rule nisi be issued in terms of the interdict returnable on a date to be determined by the court calling upon the respondents to show cause why an order in terms of the above prayers should not be made final.

According to Dlamini, in his affidavit filed before Judge Mzwandile Fakudze on Tuesday, on February 15, 2018 at Ezulwini, the first respondent (Micro Projects) convened a meeting of members of the community and present at the meeting were the community members only and the inner council from Ezulwini Umphakatsi sent by Chief Mashampu.

Dlamini alleged in his affidavit that the decision to construct the hall was taken by the second respondent (chief) without the involvement or participation of the members of the community as a representative from the royal kraal informed the meeting that finances for the construction had been secured from Micro Projects,

which is under the ministry of economic planning and development and that it was to com-

"Some of the community members present at the meeting reacted with shock and expressed their dismay at the decision taken without them being consulted, involvement and being allowed to participate in the planning and implementation of the construction project and I was one of those," Dlamini alleged.

Dissatisfaction

He stated that he, together with the other residents, expressed their dissatisfaction with the project through a letter dated February 18, 2018 addressed to the first respondent and subsequent to the letter of complaint, the chief and his inner council convened another meeting in order to explain the exigencies of the construction and get the community to participate.

Dlamini stated in his affidavit that Chief Mashampu convened zonal meeting (tigcuma), where the issue of the community hall was discussed despite advice that it be held at umphakatsi level where the hall issue arose.

Represented by senior attorney and human

rights lawyer Thulani Maseko, Dlamini argued that in terms of Section 7 of the Finance Management and Audit Act of 1967, the role of Micro Projects is to facilitate the implementation of developmental projects within the spirit and ambit of the Act and has to take into account the views, involvement and participation of the commu-

"I am advised and verily accept that it is essential that as members of the community of Ezulwini, we are to be involved in the development agenda of the community. We are further advised that public involvement in decision making is in-built in Section 79 of the Constitution," Dlamini

This section provides emphases and devolution of state power from central government to tinkhundla areas.

He submitted that the matter is urgent and hearing it on the normal course will render it academic as the violation which he seeks to stop will have taken place and near completion.

Dlamini submitted that the enrolment of the matter on urgent basis is justified on grounds that the respondents have already cleared and dug trenches on the land where they intend to build the community hall, hence it has been brought with a certificate of urgency.

APPLICANT HAS NO LOCUS STANDI, HALL CONSTRUCTED AT ROYAL KRAAL - INDVUNA

IN his answering affidavit to the allegations made by the applicant, the Headman of the Royal Kraal (Indvuna Yemcuba) Wilson Ndlavela Mavimbela argued that the applicant (Dlamini) has no locus standi to seek the relief he is seeking as regards the community hall issue.

Mavimbela, in his affidavit, stated that an applicant instituting proceedings must allege facts in the launching affidavit indicating that he has the necessary locus standi to institute same and must show direct and substantial interest in the relief sought and such must be based on a legally enforceable right.

According to Mavimbela, the structure that Dlamini seeks to stop being constructed is being constructed in a royal kraal wherein the chief is in charge as governor.

The urgency alleged by the applicant, according to Mavimbela, is nothing but a smokescreen and an abuse of court process, applicant has been given the opportunity to voice his views, not even once, but twice on the project and the fact that he and a few of his cohorts is against the project, does not make the matter any urgent.

"The issue of the community hall is a long

standing one and its construction issue was raised in 2007 after the community saw the need to have a multi-purpose hall which the community could use for holding community meetings and which government can use as a development centre to bring her services closer to the people," Mavimbela submitted.

The hall is also aimed at being used as offices for the umphakat- According to si and various Emabandla (development committees) and to that end, Mavimbela argued that the community of Ezulwini has displayed their commitment to the project by making monetary contributions towards the realisation of this dream and to date, the community had contributed more than E40 000 towards the

The indvuna submitted that on or about April 12, 2017 the inner council formally applied for financial assistance from the community development special fund managed by Micro Projects under the ministry of economic planning and

He stated that the umphakatsi is made up of seven zones (tigcuma) being Mvutjini, Somjalose, Gelekeceni, Nyonayne, Ntshakabili, Lomngalaza and Buka and after the funding was confirmed, a meeting was convened where the communi-

ty members were informed of the construction of the community hall.

"I must state that the majority of the people present at the meeting appreciated the project and its commencement. The applicant, however, objected to the construction and was supported by one Bhekisisa Abraham Bhembe, who is the Indvuna Yenkhundla for Lobamba as well as other five individuals," Mavimbela stated. However, in

a view to put the issue of the community hall to rest, the umphakatsi leadership visited the various zones (tigcuma) to gather their views and opinions towards the construction of the hall and the majority was in favour of the construction.

Matter constitutional, referred to full bench

HIGH Court Judge Mzwandile Fakudze did not hear the matter in open court but met both parties in his chambers, where he postponed it to June 7.

This, after he noted that the matter is constitutional and ordered that it will be heard by a full bench on the said date.

Human rights lawyer Thulani Maseko and Bonginkosi Dlamini from the Attorney General's Chambers were called to Justice Fakudze's chambers where they were advised formally that the matter is constitutional.

Meanwhile, Dlamini, together with the aggrieved residents who had crammed the court, waited for the resumption of the matter in Court D while others waited outside in readiness to follow the proceedings, but they were later informed by court officials that the matter has now been referred to the full bench with their lawyer expected to inform them of the dates for hearing.

Having come on board a Toyota Quantum and other vehicles, the residents were seen leaving the court thereafter while counsel Maseko and Dlamini proceeded Justice Fakudze's chambers later at

180 TRAINEE PARAMEDICS NOT PAID FOR TWO YEARS

ABOUT 180 trainee paramedics in Northern Hhohho are complaining that they have been engaged in practicals since 2016 while waiting to be employed by government.

The same trainees also complained that while they have been patiently waiting for employment, other 300 new trainees have been introduced to the region.

It is said the original group of 180 trainees was introduced to Northern Hhohho under the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in 2016. At the time, they were told to complete about one year of practicals before they could be hired as fully fledged paramedics.

Under that aforementioned agreement, the 180 trainees where supposed to be hired as paramedics in 2017 but this did not happen as only eight were hired.

In 2018, while the original group of trainees was still waiting to be hired as paramedics a new group of 300 new trainees joined the old ones for practicals, which has infuriated the original group who has been working for free since 2016.

Speaking to this publication on Tuesday, the trainees who asked that their identities be concealed in fear of reprisals at their work place, said it was very hard to work for free for two long years.

"It is very hard working for free, we

all joined this profession with the hope of saving people's lives as well as getting paid, but this has not happened and our original group has dwindled in size as more and more people have dropped out due to the lack of employment.

It is painful to work this long without getting paid and a lot of people don't know that we trainees actually got a tertiary education before we became para-

Some of us got this education through

government scholarships and some had to rely on our parents to pay for our tuition fees. This is not encouraging and it is not good for us because we wake up to go to work and come home with noth-

We work strange hours and in dangerous places, honestly the government of Eswatini should start thinking about our needs because we are human and we have basic needs as well.

We can't work for free for two whole years without pay; they should inform us if there is no employment," one of

Meanwhile, when approached for comment on the issue paramedic administration at the Pigg's Peak EMS centre confirmed the story but said they were not the rightful authority to comment. They referred this publication to the Director at the Ministry of Health Dr Vusi Magagula.

When asked for comment Magagula said he was not at work and referredcomments to Principal Secretary (PS) in the Ministry of Health Dr Simon Zwane, who did not answer his phone due to the cabinet meeting that was in progress when the story was being compiled.

Efforts were also made to contact Civil Services Commission's (CSC) Owen Nxumalo as well as the Principal Secretary (PS) in the Ministry of Public Service Evart Madlopha, who both did not entertain their phones due to the daylong cabinet meeting.

The young girl did not take kindly to the comments and it is said in one of the days she arrived home crying and her brothers wanted to know what happened. She told them

she was bullied at school and also labelled as someone who was gay.

After hearing that their sister was abused, it is said the girl's brothers who were a group of four proceeded to the school where they beat up all those who were abusing their sis-

The administration of the school heard what hap-

pened and sent the girl home to fetch her parents as the actions of her brothers was viewed as dangerous and a lack of respect. They ordered the girl to bring along with her parents or brothers to give an account of their action.

The girl's mother had complained bitterly that her daughter was missing a lot in terms of lessons and it was then that she decided take the matter up with the relevant authorities and her first stop was social welfare offices and then to the regional education offices.

It is said a decision was taken that the administration should allow the girl back to class unconditionally. A team from the Regional Education Officer (REO) was sent to the school with the purpose of finding a lasting solution in the matter.

It is said the girl returned to class last Friday as the officials from the ministry started working on the issue from Wednesday where it was ruled the previous day that the administration should make sure the issue was resolved.

The girl's mother also confirmed that her daughter was expected back in class after officials from the ministry ordered.

"The officials from the ministry handling the matter resolved that my daughter should return to school.

I have been assured

of her safety and no one would bull her or call her with a name undermining her. She has been counseled and I hope she is going to cope and focus in her school work," said the moth-

firmed that the issue was now handled by the ministry of education and training.

"It is true that the girl is back in class.

After all, she was not expelled by anyone but we only requested her to fetch parents following the episode which unfolded. I wanted her back in class while other issues were handled by the parties concerned," said Shongwe.

No arrest so far in E200 000 daring robbery at MTN shop

POLICE have not yet made an arrest in the armed robbery which saw thieves raiding an MTN outlet and snatching over E200 000 on Monday.

Members of the public in the bustling city of Manzini were treated to a movie like scene when heavily armed robbers attacked an MTN outlet and stole the money.

Information gathered is that the incident which left employees of the outlet which sells cellphones and airtime shocked, occurred in broad daylight at around lunch time on Monday.

It is said the staff had prepared money and was just getting ready to take it to the bank when the incident hap-

A security personnel, who was found at the accident scene, said he noted two guys who did not look suspicious in any way as they went to buy a cold drink at a shop which is on the same complex with the MTN outlet, located near the Old Trade Fair.

The guard said the two men sat for some time conversing and enjoying their drinks. It is said after some time a BMW vehicle pulled up on the scene and the occupants were joined by the two who were enjoying their drinks and they approached the shop.

It is alleged that the thieves were heavily armed and shots were fired as they demanded money from the employees of the shop.

Seeing that the suspects were heav-

ily armed no one tried to stop them as they made away with the cash.

Some of the witnesses found at the scene said they were really disappointed that police took their time to arrive after they were called and when they eventually did the thugs were long gone. Worth noting is that these days police officers are all over town manning election registration centres. Coincidentally, at the complex where the robbery took place, there are police officers deployed at a voter registration centre which is just a stone throw away from where the robbery took place. It has been revealed that one of the thugs is known to some people who work around the complex as some revealed that he would from time to time go to the outlet to buy

This has led to those who have seen the suspect frequenting the place to believe that he was pretending to buy airtime while in reality he was just surveying the area.

The manager of the shop when asked for comments declined to talk to the media as he stated that he was too busy. Such an incident comes at a time when a series of audacious robberies by heavily armed gangs in the country have been reported and seemingly crime groups are increasing in firepower and committing daring robberies in broad daylight.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Khulani Mamba confirmed the robbery, saying police received a report about an outlet which was robbed money amounting to E200 000 in Manzini.


Driven by the passion to prove their competitors that with or without electricity they can compete, speaker after another submitted on how the country has been boosted by agribusiness.

DOUBLE TRAGEDY AS EBENEZER LOSES TWO PUPILS IN 48 HRS

IT was double tragedy at Ebenezer High after the school lost two pupils within a space of 48 hours.

The school, situated a few kilometres from Hlatikulu town, under Mtsambama Inkhundla, had to turn back pupils on Monday after they were told that two of their colleagues died in separate incidents.

It is said some of the teachers and pupils were so emotional that others broke down upon hearing the devastating news, turning the morning assembly turning into a funeral mood.

It has reliably been gathered that last

when a kombi ran over him after he fell from the back of a truck near the school. He had got a lift with others.

The pupil, identified as Phelelani Ndzinisa, is said to have leaned on the side of the truck, which was not properly closed as he fell onto the road and just before he could pick himself up, an oncoming kombi ran over him:

This shocking accident, which left almost everyone shell-shocked, was confirmed by the police.

The boy was doing Form Two and was a resident of Ebenezer. It is said Phelelani was planning to join other school-mates to cheer his school during the ball games on the same day.

While still trying to come to terms

Friday, one of the pupils was killed with losing Phelelani, pupils residing around Ebenezer, learnt that another colleague had also died while receiving medical attention at the Hlatikulu Government Hospital.

It's said the girl died last Sunday.

"It was painful and some of the teachers and pupils cried hysterically while others comforted their heartbroken classmates. We were then advised to return home as lessons could not continue under such circumstances," said a source at the school.

It's said teachers then proceeded to

the two bereaved homesteads to pass their condolences.

Of note is that the two pupils' homesteads are situated close to each other.

There was no immediate comment from the school administration as several efforts to get the Principal Dumisani Shabangu hit a snag.

His deputy Boy Mmango's cellphone also rang several times without being answered.

On the other hand, Mtsambama Member of Parliament Richard Mphaya Simelane said he was not ready to comment about the matter as it was sensitive. He only confirmed to have heard about the death of two pupils from the school.

However, he did not have details but only passed condolences to the families as well as the school and the community at large.

"I am told that the two pupils are from the same area (Ebenezer). I can't say much as I am also still devastated," said MP Simelane, who is a former principal of the school.

No election campaigns at Correctional facilities

OFFENDERS around the country might have been allowed to vote in the 2018 elections but candidates who would like to convince inmates to vote for them will not get that chance to canvass for votes as they (candidates) will not be allowed entry at Correctional Services facilities to campaign.

Early last week when voter registration began, it was revealed that the Elections and Boundaries Commission, which has set a schedule for registering all qualifying inmates, is geared to visit all 14 centres of the department having started at the Correctional Staff College.

It was said Commissioner General of His Majesty's Correctional Services Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase, who has also registered for the elections, expressed gratitude to the King for ushering a new era in the department by allowing inmates to take part in the national elections.

Ntshangase is said to have informed reporters that as the department aligns itself with international correctional standards, inmates across the various facilities have been allowed to register through the assistance of the Elections and Boundaries Commission.

However, aspiring candidates have raised their concern that registering inmates to vote might raise other problems because when the time for campaigning comes they might not be allowed to visit inmates in order to convince them what they will do for the country if they are voted and this, it has been alleged, will lead to inmates making uninformed decisions on who to vote

Worth noting is that Correctional centres currently keep about 3 500 offenders.

People who are hoping to be running for the various positions include tindvuna tetinkhundla, bucopho and Members of Parliament have expressed concern that if they are not allowed to go into correctional facilities, such might result to corruption as officers can turn into bogalajane (agents) and convince inmates to vote for their (officers) own candidates.

According to regulations of national elections. the campaign process in the electoral system takes place immediately after the announcement of the primary elections results until a day before the poll.


It is said in the first stage, there must be an organised campaign which is initiated by the Commission and its purpose is to introduce the candidates in the chiefdoms under that constituency. During this stage, candidates are given an opportunity to present their agenda in line with the national vision.

The electorate is then given the opportunity to interrogate the candidates so as to make an informed decision on the day of the poll. However, such will not happen for inmates even though they have been given the opportunity to vote.

HMCS Public Relations Officer (PRO) Gugulethu Dlamini, when asked if aspiring candidates will be allowed to visit correctional facilities for campaign purposes when the time is right, clearly stated that no one will be allowed to campaign in correctional centres.

Dlamini said instead, pictures of candidates with their information would be put up at the correctional centers.

She said inmates know people from their areas, hence they will not have a problem in knowing who to vote for. This, however, goes against the campaign rule which states that the electorate must interrogate candidates.

THE African perspective on doing things emphasises collaboration, its more about the community and less about what can be done by the individual alone.

This assertion is embodied in two African proverbs. The first from the Masai people of Kenya saying, "If you want to go fast, go alone. If you want to go far, go together,"and the second is attributed to the Igbo and Yoruba in Nigeria, "It takes a village to raise a child."

As for the second, I have not heard a better definition of its meaning than that given by musician Brian Nhira (whose Zimbabwean parents moved to the US over 30 years ago) in his graduation speech to over 10 000 people at the Oral Roberts University. Nhira whose definition holds true, the spirit of Eswatini culture, said:

"The upbringing of a single child is an effort that can only be successfully completed by the collective efforts of a community of people, sowing into the life of the child, in the ways of the village and even disciplining, so that he/she can grow up to be a successful and independent human being.

Everyone in the village gets involved in the process of raising the child moms, dads, siblings, cousins, etc. Everyone in the village carries within them, something that the child will need to successfully grow up."

In Eswatir i, the child is referred to as "UmlibaLoyaEmbili" meaning that children are the future - as the continued existence of the people of Eswatini rests with them. In moulding the lives of future generations, the culture of EmaSwati embraces that the conduct of a child should concern everybody, and not just the parents and close relatives.

We go on to say 'Umtfwana wemmango', that a child belongs to the community they are raised in. This is especially true when a child has engaged in unbecoming behaviour, where all adults have the right to rebuke or discipline that child - even going to the extent of informing the child's parents of their rebuke so they can enforce the discipline. away some of our noble values and given rise of individualistic, selfish and self-centred modern-day citizenry, who only care about themselves.

The winds of change are at our doorstep and slowly, programmes like HIV prevention and the institutions involved, are recognising the value of collective efforts of communities.

There is now a consensus that if we want to end AIDS as a public health threat in the Kingdom of Eswatini, we need meaningful engagement of our communities.

A synopsis of the HIV response in Eswatini


The Kingdom of Eswatini has a persistent HIV and AIDS epidemic with the highest HIV prevalence rate in the world, at 27.0 percent among adults ages 15 years and older, approximately 210 000 people are living with HIV and AIDS. Annually, the country experiences approximately 7 000 new cases of HIV

This is a serious public health concern and presents socio-economic development challenges for the government of the Kingdom of Eswatini.

The recently ended extended National Strategic Framework (eNSF) 2014-2018, focused on halting the spread of HIV and reversing its impact on the Eswatini society.

The focus was on the complex interrelated factors that influence the transmission of HIV, a clear priority on the populations most vulnerable to HIV acquisition, and an emphasis on the high-impact interventions that prevent and reduce transmission and acquisition of the virus among the

The eNSF recognised that "individual and social factors are both a cause and potential solution of the epidemic, which is seen as a reflection of the patterns of behaviour in society, the complexities of our sexuality, our relationships, our beliefs and attitudes that influence the transmission of HIV." In responding therefore, a combination prevention approach was found to be the most logical approach, with a standardised core package of prevention interventions tailored to specific priority popula-



The Core Package for **HIV Prevention**

As a means of supporting national HIV prevention efforts, the National Emergency Response Council on HIV/AIDS (NERCHA) and partners have come up with a Core Package for HIV Prevention to support prevention efforts to address the strategic gap of 'inadequate targeting and lack of intensity among HIV prevention programmes" noted in the implementation of the eNSF.

The Core Package guidelines offera standardised approach to design, development and management of targeted HIV prevention programmes and provides a set of guidelines to help programme managers focus their interventions on priority populations and sub-populations that are driving the epidemic.

Programming across the core prevention package is driven by the fundamental principle that "the HIV epidemic is about locations and populations" and that we can circumvent transmission by focusing on areas and populations with higherprobabilities of transmission and acquisition. For one package is constructed arten a priority population and its unique epidemiological and behavioural profile. The priority populations for the Core Packages are those at high risk of acquiring or transmitting HIV, including Adolescent girls (AG: 15-19 years); Young Women (YW: 20-24 years); Adult men (25-39 years); and Adolescent boys and young men (ABYM: 15-24 years). These populations experience significant HIV burden and they influence the dynamics of the HIV epi-

Community engagement the driving force in new **HIV** prevention efforts

Community engagement is a key objective that is prioritised in several national documents, including the recently ended eNSF as a "critical enabler" to identify high-risk groups, create demand for and use of services, and critically to help reduce vulner-

Additionally, in its 2013-2018 Strategic Plan, the Ministry of Tinkhundla Administration and Development (MTAD) emphasized the role of community mobilization and action in key development pillars, including HIV and AIDS

The MTAD Strategic Plan identified people-focused service delivery as a central strategic objective. In collaboration with MTAD, MOH and partners, NERCHA created community engagement guidelines designed to complement the eNSF. The guidelines describe a systematic approach to effective community engagement through multiple layers from chiefdom to Inkhundla, region and nation, bringing together multiple sectors to catalyse a community-led response that can address social and behavioural barriers to uptake of and retention in health services.

Engaging communities effectively will become a core activity for the new HIV prevention efforts as no matter who the population or population segment is, the transmission of HIV results primarily from social and cultural factors - and only secondarily from biomedical ones.

There is a common understanding that intimate behaviours, such as sexual relationships and practices, are shaped and affected more by community norms than clinical factors. The conclusion therefore is that the success of any HIV prevention intervention requires engagement well beyond the traditional health sector and must extend into the community. As the Rwandan proverb says, "The dancers have changed, but the drums are the same". I say, even though the challenges are different, the people of Eswatini will once again look to emphasise collaboration.

It is time for communities to rise and play a meaningful part in the health and future of their people. And yes, even communities of key popu-

As they have yielded to the spirit and given themselves up as channels of intercessory prayer, Revival fires have been fanned into flame, the church has been purified and sinners converted.



How many more must die of Ebola in DRC before its an emergency?

IF 30 people died from a virus highly contagious and is spread through and racism led to the Ebola crisis of declared Ebola over in that country. the world, it would have been described as a public health emergency.

Not when it is the Democratic Republic of Congo.

Since May 8, an estimated 26 people have died from Ebola out of 45 suspected to have the virus.

According to Doctors Without Borders (MSF), 514 people who may have been in contact with infected people are being monitored.

The latest incarnation of the virus started in a rural part of north-western DRC, before it moved to Mbandaka a city of 1.2 mill on people. Ebola

ical contact with infected bodily fluids. The virus induces a haemorrhaging fever that can lead to fatal bleeding.

There is still no cure for the virus. "It is concerning that we now have cases of Ebola in an urban centre, but we are much better placed to deal with this outbreak than we were in 2014," Dr Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, the WHO Director-General, said on Monday.

Between 2014 and 2016, the virus spread through West Africa killing at least 11 000 people in mainly Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone.

IMPORTANCE OF GENDER DIVERSITY IN LEADERSHIP

RECENT years have seen an increasing focus on female leadership.

Women have made substantial gains not only in the workplace, but in more significant leadership roles such as heads of state.

Despite this positive evolution, the number of female leaders is surprisingly low. This is puzzling because women seem to be more empowered than they were in the past few decades.

Furthermore, women not only attain more education than a couple of decades ago, they also seem to attain more education than their male counterparts. But why are they still occupying less leadership positions than men?

Well, there are many pitfalls to female leadership, including stereotypes and discrimination. Society still puts women in a box that prevents them from climbing the leadership ladder.

Another pitfall is the fact that women continuously have to navigate between work and taking care of the home, and are forced to take more leave, maternity breaks, and work more regular hours.

Disadvantage

Another disadvantage that comes with this expectation is that people expect women to put less effort into work than men, on the assumption that in the navigation between family and career, women will choose family as their primary con-

Discrimination and prejudice is another pitfall to female leadership. These forms of discriminatory



ing processes creating prejudice, which is the third factor that recognise as a possible pitfall for female

It does not necessarily concern outright forms of prejudice, but relates rather to subtle links which people tend to make the link between male traits and leadership traits a consequence of two phenomena, gender stereotyping and gender symbolism.

Even with the many pitfalls to female leadership, there have been positive strides as well. Women's access to leadership roles creates a gain for equal opportunities. We have to admit that when a woman is in leadership, she will ensure equality in distribution of resources for both women and men. Meaning, everyone will be happy and feel involved. There will not be an imbalanced consumption of resources that were meant to be shared equally by all members of society. That is an advantage for both sexes.

Taxes could reduce Africa's heavy reliance on development aid

TAXATION is not the nicest of subjects to talk about lately, not especially at Eswatini, with the Finance Bill of 2018 proposing an increase in over 15 duties, taxes, user fees and

However, if put to proper use, taxes can significantly reduce African countries' heavy reliance on aid for development.

Resource mobilisation is one of the African Continental Free Trade Area's (AcFTA) key tenets also vouched for by the African Tax Administration Forum (ATAF).

This subject was one of those which took centre-stage in an ATAF side event in the recent 51st session of the Economic Commission for Africa (ECA) and the conference of African ministers of finance, planning and economic development held at the United Nations Conference Centre in Addis Ababa two weeks ago.

The ministerial segment was preceded by a preparatory meeting of the committee of experts.

The AcFTA pushes for minimal reliance on donors to help bolster development, so that countries like Eswatini can use taxes as an engine for economic growth.

However, such efforts are constantly being undermined by illicit financial flows which drain the continent of an estimated \$50 billion every

As a voice on African tax issues to inform and influence the global dialogue, ATAF is increasingly becoming important in the development and shaping of tax policy in the continent.

Legislation

The organisation recently achieved revised legislation on transfer pricing in many countries where these legislations have come into law.

Also, ATAF has played an important role in revenue mobilisation through technical assistance programmes that have identified revenue gaps and have returned money to countries to the tune of over \$150 million.

Even though taxation remains a sensitive matter for many Emaswati at the moment, one of the issues which emerged in ATAF's side event at the 51st ECA was the need to address trade mis-invoicing and abusive transfer pricing by some multi-national corporations through technical assistance and country cooperation at a continental level.

A call was also made by Akingbolahan Adeniran, Rule of Law Advisor to the Vice-President of Nigeria, to 'amplify advocacy' for the return of illicit financial assets from developed countries to source countries on the African continent.

In the meantime, ATAF Executive Secretary Logan Wort and the African Union Commission Vice-Chair engaged in a discussion on advancing capacity for effective tax administration to enhance domestic resource mobilisation, curbing tax frauds and corruption in Africa, with the aim of improving the living standards of the continent's people.

AFRICA'S TRADE PATTERN STILL A CAUSE FOR GREAT CONCERN

AFRICA's trade performance was boosted, lately, by the global economic recovery and commodities exports.

However, the composition and direction of the continent's trade remains highly worrisome and to a large extent imbalanced, delegates attending the 51st session of Conference of African Ministers of Finance, Planning and Economic Development observed.

Themed the 'African Continental Free Trade Area' (ACFTA), the conference was held in Addis Ababa two weeks ago and attended by hundreds of delegates including ministers of finance, planning and development from 45 countries, regional economic communities, United Nations bodies, representatives from international and regional organisations and observers from non-African countries.

A high powered delegation from the African Tax Adminstration Forum (ATAF) led by the organisation's Executive Secretary Logan Wort also participated in this meeting.

Experts noted that while intra-African exports had increased over the past few years, that same trend was not reflected in intra-African imports, which showed the effect of underdeveloped regional

value chains and low levels of intraregional trade in intermediate goods among African countries.

The ACFTA, which officially came into being ealier this year, is expected, amongst other things, to address the barriers to trade amongst African countries themselves whilst providing a platform for enhancing productive integration and value chain development in Africa.

Other concerns that emerged from deliberations bordered on the regularity, quality and relevance of the statistics used on the continent, in particular those pertaining to social development issues.

Availability

Experts stressed that ECA must take the steps necessary to ensure the timely availability of data and statistics, as the latter remained critical for development planning, policy design and implementation.

The Kingdom of Eswatini was among the first countries to sign the ACFTA, which amongst many other key functions is also expected to reduce African country's heavy reliance on development assistance and to enhance domestic resource mobilisation as the engine of the continent's economic growth.

However, like other countries, Eswatini has not taken notable steps to ratify the

treaty unlike Ghana and Kenya which have already have made bold strides by depositing instruments for ratification.

ECA Executive Secretary Vera Songwe encouraged signatories to capitalise on the ACFTA by creating fiscal spaces to foster investments to ensure economic diversification and job creation.

If implemented, the ACFTA contains suitable strategies for countries to diversify their economies, industrialise and develop and ways in which small and medium enterprises should be empowered and geared towards entrepreneurship.

Despite the ACFTA being in place, there is a lot that still needs to be done to ensure its full operationalisation.

Permanent Representative of Ethiopia to the African Union and ECA, Woinshet Tadesse outlined the outstanding issues as being the first phase of negotiations which still must be resolved and the commitment needed from member states to reach consensus during the second phase for the agreement to benefit all member states.

Tadesse also emphasised on the need for the agreement to be accompanied by national strategies to build productive capacities and put in place trade related infrastructure inorder to ensure equitable benefits to all African countries

'One-third lump sum provident fund pay-out free from taxation'

THE Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA) has assured that taxation of one third of the lump sum payout of provident funds is free from taxation, Director of Communications Vusi Dlamini said.

He said that since the balance of two thirds is paid out in the form of an annuity (monthly payouts), this annuity is, therefore, subjected to taxation like all other employment income.

He further explained that during the life of the contributions, tax relief is afforded to the taxpayer.

"In essence, tax relief for pension fund affords tax relief before taxation and during the life of the contributions whereas with provident fund relief is postponed till retirement," Dlamini explained, also highlighting the E360 rebate afforded on provident fund contributions on a yearly basis.

Dlamini also assured that the payment of such benefits is governed by the fund rules in line with Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA)'s regulations.

Moving forward, Dlamini assured implications.

that no changes would take place regarding tax treatment of pension funds.

"The current treatment of pension fund benefits is what has always been occurring," he affirmed. Retirement funds have the same meaning as defined in the Retirement Funds Act of 2005.

SRA's tax training coach at Ntsizwa Muthasa last week described retirement funds as being businesses carried on with the purpose of providing annuities and or lump sumbenefits for members on their retirement or to the dependants of such members on the death of such members.

Muthasa was speaking during the second annual Swaziland National Provident Fund Stakeholder Forum held at the Happy Valley Hotel.

On another note, Muthasa said transfer from one pension fund, irrespective of whether the fund is a defined benefit or defined contribution to another pension fund, shall not be subject to tax.

He also highlighted that transfer from one provident fund to another would also not be subject to tax while transfer between pension and provident fund would result in tax implications.

WHILST the debate between biotechnology farming and traditional methods continues, the Swaziland Environment Authority (SEA) has assured farmers of a safe environment.

The organisation made an undertaking to continually ensure that food produced and consumed in the country is

This was said by the Minister of Tourism and Environmental Affairs Christopher Gamedze during the official opening of the Biosafety Indaba held at Royal Swazi Sun on Tuesday.

"SEA is regulated by the Biosafety Act 2012.

"The major objective of the act is to ensure an adequate level of protection in the field of safe transfer, handling and use of genetically modified organisms (GMOs) resulting from modern biotechnology that may have adverse effects on the conservation and sustainable use of biological diversity, taking into account human health," he said.

The minister recognised the Act as providing a transparent and predictable process for review and decision making for GMOs and related activities.

He aggested that this could be achieved by regulating GMOs. Procedurally, farmers intending to import GMOs must apply for an import permit from SEA. The supplier is also expected to apply for an export permit.

NATIONAL TOURISM POLICY REVIEW IN FINAL STAGES

THE review of the national tourism policy is now in its final stages.

The review process is being handled by South African consultant Christele Gronhmann.

Yesterday, different stakeholders met at the City Court in Mbabane to discuss each of the policy's provisions.

One of the provisions is that the media must support tourism awareness programmes to the population at large by providing coverage and supporting special campaigns to promote responsible tourism initiatives.

EBOLA DEATH TOLL HITS 27 IN DR CONGO

MBANDAKA - The death toll from ebola in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) has risen to 27, the health ministry said on Tuesday, after a fatality was recorded in a city on the front line of the outbreak.

The death, which involved a person confirmed by lab tests as having the viral disease, occurred in Wangata, a district of Mbandaka, the ministry said in a press release.

So far, there have been 51 cases since the outbreak was declared on May 8, it said. Of these, 28 cases have been confirmed, 21 are probable and two are suspected.

One of the world's most notorious diseases, ebola is a virus-caused haemorrhagic fever that in extreme cases leads to fatal bleeding from internal organs, the mouth, eyes or ears. The outbreak began in rural

northwestern DRC in a remote location called Bikoro, about 150km away. Last Thursday, a first case was reported in Mbandaka, an event that triggered international concern.

The city of around 1.2 million people, lies on the congo river, where it is a transport hub to Brazzaville and Kinshasa downstream and to Bangui, upstream. The health authorities on Monday began administering a prototype vaccine to a small number of health workers in Mbandaka, as part of the campaign to contain and roll back the disease.

The immunisation team will follow suit on Saturday in Bikoro, vaccinating more than 600 people in all for the first phase of the operation.

The outbreak is the ninth in the DRC since the disease was first identified in 1976. It was named after a Congolese river where the first cases

UN criticises Algeria for mass deportation of migrants

ENEVA/ALGIERS - The **United Nations on Tuesday** urged Algeria to stop rounding up and expelling sub-Saharan migrants, highlighting an influx of immigrants from Mali and Niger that Algeria says it needs UN help to address.

Hassen Kacimi, a senior official at Algeria's Interior Ministry, told Reuters on Saturday that, Algeria had called for help from the international community, while the United Nations had done little to save the migrants.

UN spokeswoman Ravina Shamdasani told a regular UN briefing in Geneva that depor-

increased markedly since the second half of 2017, and a UN human rights team went to Niger to investigate this month.

"What they heard was that Algerian authorities frequently carry out mass round-ups of sub-Saharan African migrants in various parts of the country," Shamdasani said.

tations and expulsions have not allowed to pick up their belongings, passports or money before being expelled. "Some are crammed into big trucks to be transferred to the Nigerien border where they are abandoned and left to walk hours in the desert heat to cross the border into Niger," she said. Algeria says it faces a huge influx of migrants. "A surge of migration is invading the south of Algeria," Kacimi said.

CAIRO - Egypt's army has drastically stepped up its demolitions of homes, businesses and farms in the Sinai since launching a widespread campaign against militants in February, Human Rights Watch said on Tuesday. The watchdog said it documented at least 3 000 homes and commercial properties destroyed in the peninsula, where Egypt has battled a long-running jihadist insurgency, as well as 600 razed just before the latest military operation. "He said to us, 'Let me drive quickly to the location and go to different taverns where they drink,' and when he arrived, at a place they call Lunchbox, he called us and said he has seen the car," Marite said.

Marite said she and her family all rushed to the scene, along with the police and members of the community crime watch group. The three men who were in the vehicle similar to the one that drove off with Katlego were taken by the police.



SA woman, 25, found dead in the Bahamas

NASSAU - The family of a South African woman has been left with more questions than answers after the 25-year-old's body was found in a hotel in the Bahamas.

Carla van Eeden had finished crewing on a yacht and decided to spend a few days relaxing on Paradise Island, off Nassau, before making her way to the US, the family's lawyer William Booth told News24.

While information is still sketchy, local media were reporting that police found her body hanging by a cord at the back of the bathroom door of her hotel last week. "Her family are a bit traumatised and upset and are not able to understand how it happened. They are extremely shocked," Booth said. A petite Van Eeden shared her recent and extensive travels on Facebook. Last month, she expressed her excitement at having attended the Coachella music and arts festival. She made her way to Mexico "for some serious down time", followed by a quick stop in Cape Town before heading back to the US.

Her brother contacted Booth, a well-

known criminal lawyer who has represented people involved in several highprofile murder cases over the past few years, to help police probe her murder and to give the family advice.

Booth said not much information had yet been relayed by authorities, and the cause of death was not yet known.

Some family members flew over to the island this week to get more answers.

They had asked South African authorities at the nearest embassy to meet up with them and assist diplomatically.

4 shot dead, 6 injured in Brakpan

BRAKPAN - Four people were shot and killed amid taxi-related violence in Brakpan, in Ekurhuleni, on Wednesday morning.

The incident happened around 09:00 on the corner of High Street and Wenden Avenue. Police spokesperson Captain Pearl van Staad said the Brakpan taxi association had held a meeting to resolve their complaints.

Van Staad said: "There was a dispute amongst themselves" relating to taxi routes between Brakpan and Tsakane. This resulted in the shootings. Four people were killed and six others were injured and taken to Far East Rand Hospital. Van Staad said eight others were arrested. Parly sets up feasibility study to look into move to Pretoria

CAPE TOWN - National Assembly Speaker Baleka Mbete says an external service provider has been appointed to look into the feasibility of moving Parliament to Pretoria.

Former president Jacob Zuma first made the suggestion, in his 2016 State of the Nation Address, to move the national legislature to the country's cap-

This was in order to cut costs, he argued. During Parliament's budget debate on Tuesday, Mbete announced that Pamoja PTY LTD had been appointed to conduct a "six-month socio-economic and impact study" on the proposal, commencing this month. "This [is] a matter that we will hand over to the sixth



Parliament," Mbete said in her speech. That means the results of the study and its feasibility or non-feasibility will be looked at only after the 2019 gener-

al elections by the newly-elected Parliament. Zuma said, in his SONA two years ago, that a "big expenditure item that we would like to persuade Parliament to consider the maintenance of two capitals, Pretoria as the administrative one and Cape Town as the legislative capital". It was costly for Cabinet to spread its work over the two capitals, he said at the time. "This must not come at expense of workers and families. In February 2016, Congress of SA Trade Unions (Cosatu) and Nomura economist Peter Attard Montalto said moving South Africa's Parliament from Cape Town to Pretoria would cost R7bn, but could bring savings of around R500m to R750m a year. BABY BORN WITH HER BRAIN OUTSIDE HER HEAD

A toddler who was given just 20 minutes to live after being born with her brain outside her skull has made a miraculous recovery.

Karlie Toland, now 17 months, is thought to be the only person in the world to suffer from five rare conditions, including encephalocele, which caused her brain to develop on the outside of her head.

Defying the odds, Karlie was discharged from hospital, but medics still insisted she would die within days.

After four weeks, Karlie's parents Gemma Mccusker, 24, and Kyle Toland, 20, took their daughter to Belfast's Royal Hospital for Sick Children, where the youngster underwent a five-hour operation.

Surgeons are thought to have removed Karlie's outer brain before closing the wound.

Fully recovered, Karlie is now crawling and able to eat on her own, with her parents hoping she will take her first steps in the next few months.

Ms Mccusker, the toddler's mother, said: "Looking at her now makes me so proud, she's always smiling, laughing and happy, she's such a little miracle we don't know what the future holds for Karlie but we are sure she will continue to defy the odds."

Speaking of her daughter's birth, Ms Mccusker said: "I was told my daughter would die within 20 minutes.

I was heartbroken and although she had part of her brain outside of her skull, she looked perfect.

But she refused to give up and we knew she was strong enough to pull through despite everything we were told by doctors.

'After being discharged from hospital we went home with Karlie and used bottles of sterile water at room temperature and cotton wabs to

wipe away the brain fluid leaking from her skull.

'We had been told Karlie would die in the next few days but she defied everyone and once we got a second opinion, four weeks later, she had the operation she desperately needed."

Ms Mccusker was told during her pregnancy her daughter would likely be born with deformities, but did not expect her brain to be outside her skull.

She said: "During my pregnancy

I was told at my 20-week scan there was something abnormal on her head but we had no idea what it was until she was born.

'I was told to prepare myself for missing limbs, her nose to be on her forehead and that she might not even have eyes.

'But Karlie had none of those deformities and was born with all of the correct facial features and limbs."

As well as encephalocele, Karlie also has cerebral palsy; an abnormal brain structure, called holoprosencephaly; a missing chromosone, known as 22 deletion syndrome; and microcephaly, which causes her head to be smaller than normal.

Although it is unclear how Karlie's health conditions will affect her future, her family is confident she will continue to defy expectations.

Ms Mccusker added: "We've been told by doctors that Karlie is a miracle to be alive and she really is.

'She has proven everyone wrong and even after her major operation in December 2016 she was only in hospital for 48 hours before coming home. 'We couldn't believe it and although no one expected her to progress as her brain doesn't have the normal three structures, so far she is on par with other children her age.

'The only thing she is delayed with is her walking but she can stand if I told her hand so I don't think we'll need to wait much longer.'

Karlie's parents believe the only reason their daughter is alive is due to the work of Dr Mano Shanmuganathan, a neurosurgeon at Belfast's Royal Hospital for Sick Children. Ms Mccusker said: "We are so thankful to Dr Mano that he never gave up on our daughter. His surgery saved her life and gave us a future with Karlie." *Daily Mail*

WHAT IS ENCEPHALOCELE?

ENCEPHALOCELE is a rare birth defect where the structure that forms the brain and spinal cord folds and closes.

This causes a sac-like protrustion of the brain and its covering membranes through an opening in the skull.

It affects around one in 12,200 babies born in the US every year. Its UK prevalence is unknown.

Encephalocele's exact cause is unclear but may be a combination of genetic and environmental factors, such as insufficient vitamin D and folic acid during pregnancy.

Treatment involves surgery to place the protruding brain back into the skull and close the opening.

The patient may experience ongoing complications. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention


CELEBRATED LITERARY GIANT PHILIP ROTH DIES

NEW YORK – Prolific novelist Philip Roth, a dominant force in American literature throughout the latter half of the 20th century, has died at the age of 85.

Roth's death on Tuesday, first reported by the New Yorker and The New York Times, was later confirmed by Roth's literary agent Andrew Wylie. He said the cause was congestive heart failure. Roth won the 1998 Pulitzer Prize for fiction for his acclaimed novel 'American Pastoral'. "I'm in a state of shock. I'm stunned and speechless. He was a truth teller," Roth's friend Judith Thurman, also a writer, said.

A prolific essayist and critic, Roth was best known for mining the Jewish-American experience in his work.

He first achieved fame for his 1969 novel 'Portnoy's Complaint', about a horny teenager named Alexander Portnoy. His titanic stature on the post-World War II literary scene came from the universality of his message — in his own words: "I don't write Jewish, I write American." He long

managed to sustain his literary output both in terms of quality as well as quantity, as exemplified by his widely admired political trilogy that included 'American Pastoral', 'I Married a Communist' (1998) and 'The Human Stain' (2000). The decorated author won most top literary honours, but the coveted Nobel Literature Prize eluded him. The Swedish Academy announced earlier this month there will be no Nobel Literature Prize

this year in the wake of a crisis stemming from the anti-sexual harassment #MeToo campaign.

Philip Milton Roth was born on March 19, 1933 in Newark, New Jersey, the grandson of European Jews who were part of the 19th-century wave of immigration to the United States

In 2012, Roth said that his most recent book, 'Nemesis', published two years earlier, would be his last, after having re-read all his books.

"I decided that I was done with fiction," he said. "I don't want to read any more of it, write any more of it, and I don't even want to talk about it anymore... It's enough. I no longer feel this dedication to write what I have experienced my whole life." Thurman said that after he stopped writing, Roth spent his free time reading and swimming, and meeting friends. "He was such a driven perfectionist, so when he felt his power ebbing, he wanted to quit at the top of his game, and he did," she said. *AFP*

Kim summit could be delayed - Trump

WASHINGTON - US President Donald Trump warned his landmark summit with Kim Jong Un may be delayed but insisted the North Korean leader is "serious" about denuclearisation.

Hosting South Korean President Moon Jae-in at the White House, Trump did little to quell speculation about the wavering prospects of a historic first summit between US and North Korean leaders. "It may not work out for June 12," Trump said of the Singapore meeting, adding in a now familiar noncommittal riff "if it does not happen, maybe it will happen

later." "There are certain conditions we want to happen. I think we'll get those conditions. And if we don't, we won't have the meeting."

Politically, Trump has invested heavily in the success of the meeting, and so privately most US officials, as well as outside observers, believe it will go ahead. But as the date draws near, Trump's divergence from his top aides, the differences between the two sides and the astronomically high stakes are coming into sharp relief.

Success could lead to peace on the Korean peninsula and end the threat of nuclear war. Failure could all but destroy hopes of a peaceful solution to the crisis.

"You never know about deals," Trump said. "I've made a lot of deals. You never really know."

North Korea's willingness to denuclearise — the very basis for the talks — was recently plunged into doubt when the government denounced US demands for "unilateral nuclear abandonment."

Pyongyang also cancelled at the last minute a high-level meeting with the South in protest over joint military drills between Seoul and Washington.

Archbishop steps aside after conviction

MELBOURNE - Australian Catholic Archbishop Philip Wilson said yesterday he would stand aside from his duties, a day after a court found him guilty of concealing child sex abuse by a priest.

Wilson, who faces up to two years in prison, said he was still considering the court's reasons for the judgment.

"While I do so, it is appropriate that, in the light of some of his honour's findings, I stand aside from my duties as arch-

The archbishop of Adelaide, the capital of South Australia state, and former president of the Catholic Church's top body in Australia, said he will permanently resign as archbishop if it becomes "necessary or appropriate".

Wilson was accused of covering up a serious indictable offence by another priest, James Fletcher, after being told about it in 1976 when he was an assistant parish priest in the state of New South Wales. *Reuters*

Venezuela expels US envoy in response to sanctions

CARACAS - President Nicolas Maduro ordered the expulsion of the top US diplomat in Venezuela in retaliation for a new round of sanctions over Venezuela's widely-condemned election.

The United States was among a string of countries that did not recognise Sunday's vote. The 55-year-old successor to Hugo Chavez won re-election easily, but critics said the vote was riddled with irregularities, from the barring of two popular opposition rivals to the offering of a government 'prize' to voters. President Donald Trump responded with an executive order limiting Venezuela's ability to sell state assets, heightening pressure on the cash-strapped government. Accusing US charge d'affaires Todd Robinson of being involved in "a military conspiracy," Maduro ordered him and another senior diplomat, Brian Naranjo, to leave within 48 hours. He gave no details of the accusations but said the US Embassy had been meddling in the military, economic and political issues, and vowed to present evidence to the nation shortly. "Neither with conspiracies nor with sanctions will you hold Venezuela back," Maduro said, at an event in downtown Caracas at the headquarters of the election board, which is run by government loyalists. MANCHESTER - Manchester United have told Jose Mourinho that Paul Pogba and Alexis Sanchez will not be sold any time soon - but that the duo must perform better in 2018/19 to avoid the axe next summer. That's according to a report in The Sun which believes Mourinho has been told he must get the best out of the under-performing pair next season if their time at Old Trafford is not to come to an unsatisfactory conclusion. France midfielder Pogba returned to Old Trafford back in the summer of 2016 for a then world-record fee of £89.3million - but appears to have lost his way in recent months after some inconsistent performances and an apparent falling out with Mourinho. Lampard 'dreams' of one day managing Chelsea

LONDON - Frank Lampard admits he dreams of managing former club Chelsea.

The 39-year-old spent 13 years at Stamford Bridge as a player, winning three Premier League titles, four FA Cups, the Champions League, the Europa League and two League Cups.

A highly decorated midfielder, Lampard was always seen as one of the most trusted lieutenants in the club's dressing room, along with ex-Blues defender John Terry.

While Terry is currently chasing promotion to the Premier League with Aston Villa, Lampard has transitioned into a media career, working as a pundit for BT Sport and the BBC.

Rabiot emails Deschamps rejecting WC standby spot


PARIS - Midfielder Adrien Rabiot has written to France Manager Didier Deschamps saying he is not prepared to be a World Cup standby player.

The former world number one, who started the European Tour season with top three finishes in Abu Dhabi and Dubai, is encouraged that his relationship with the course could be due a change because it has undergone a revamp since he last played it.

"I haven't played there in a couple of years (he had a rib injury last year) but from what I've seen, with the new grass that they've put in, it looks a much better golf course, a much more playable golf course," said McIlroy.

'It was always a great golf course but sometimes it could get very tricky with some of the lies you could get.

"For them to re-grass the place and for it to look as good as it does is great, and I'm looking forward to playing it."

McIlroy carded a sublime 66 in his final round to win in 2014 - an annus mirabilis for him as he went on to win two majors, the British Open and the US PGA - but Noren bettered that in some style last year with an incredible round of 62 after beginning the day seven strokes off the lead.

Noren, who will tee off with McIlroy and veteran Lee Westwood, admitted he also had his issues with the course prior to his victory.

"It's by far the biggest tournament

Real as hungry as ever, Zidane warns Liverpool

MADRID - Real Madrid coach Zinedine Zidane has warned Liverpool that his side are as hungry as ever to win the Champions League, rejecting claims that the Spanish giants might have lost their edge ahead of Saturday's final in Kiev.

There have been some suggestions that Real, having won the past two finals, might not be as motivated as Liverpool, with the English club have not tasted European glory since 2005.

"I can't talk for the opponents, but we always have the same desire as we always do and nobody can say we don't," Zidane told a news conference.

"We're in a third final and we have the chance to do something historic and win it three times in a row. You can't say Liverpool have more hunger than us; it simply isn't true.

"Nobody can take our hunger away from us. We're Real Madrid ... We always want more and will always give our all to get more."

The Frenchman also said that his side's experience of playing in and winning three finals in the past four years will have no bearing on the outcome. By comparison, no player in the Liverpool squad has reached this stage of the competition before.

"It's a one-off game, in a neutral venue. We're ready for it, but our experience doesn't count," Zidane said.

"Granted, we have more, but we need to show that we want to win it. Our experience doesn't count for anything. It's a final, they (Liverpool) haven't played, but they'll kill themselves for this and we know it."

Inevitably, talk turned to star men Cristiano Ronaldo and Mohamed Salah, but Zidane was unequivocal when asked if he would swap the Portuguese for Liverpool's Egyptian star.

"Cristiano is the best, he shows it every year," the coach said.

"Sometimes pressure gets to players and it spurs others on. He is certainly the latter. He's of maximum importance to us."

Serena's French Open seed denial stirs fresh debate

PARIS-The decision by French Open organisers not to grant Serena Williams a seeding on her long-awaited Grand Slam return has prompted renewed focus on the sport's policy towards female players and parenthood.

"French Open is punishing Serena Williams for having a baby" read a USA Today headline, arguing an expectation for the 23-time major winner to be made for today's draw.

At 36, the American is looking to regain her top form following the birth of her daughter last September. After sitting out of competition for over a year, she no longer had a ranking upon her return to the WTA circuit in March.

She has played just four matches this season across appearances at Indian Wells and Miami. But her results, far from convincing, have only been good enough to climb to 449th in the world rankings.

With a ranking so low, no player would typically even be able to take part in qualifying for the main draw. That is unless benefiting from a wildcard or using a protected ranking, which has at least allowed Williams direct entrance


It is a system that lets a player retain, for a transitional period, a former ranking upon return from a long absence - between six months and two years - due to injury, illness or pregnancy.

But it does not guarantee them a seeding, leaving Serena vulnerable to an encounter with leading title contenders as early as the first round.

At Miami, Williams ran into Indian Wells champion Naomi Osaka in her opening match and was easily beaten.

"She has won this title so many times (eight) that she needs protection," Miami tournament director James Blake said after the WTA refused to alter its rules despite conceding that they would be "further reviewed" going forward.

"It's not as if she left because of injury and lost her passion for the game," Blake said. "She had a kid, which we should all be celebrating, so when she comes back there should be a grace



period where she can still be seeded." Maria Sharapova also spoke up in support of her long-time rival last week. AFP



Top referee sentenced to 3 years imprisonment for bar fight

SOCCER - SWAZILAND's top referee Mbongiseni Fakudze and his accomplice Thabiso Dube have been found guilty of assaulting two patrons at KaGcina Bar on Friday and sentenced to three years impris-

onment. The accused appeared at Matsapha Circuit Court yesterday before Magistrate Mthokozisi Dlamini. According court records, the two were charged with

assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm in that they assaulted Banele Dlamini with a beer bottle and further assaulted him with fists. On the second count Fakudze appeared alone and he was charged with assault common in that he assaulted Mxolisi Banda with fists on the face.

Accused

Both accused persons pleaded guilty to the charge they were slapped with. Explaining their side of the story before court, Fakudze said he had gone to KaGcina to pick up his girlfriend and when he arrived there trying to take his girlfriend someone else grabbed hold of her and when he asked why he was doing that the person told him that the lady was also his girlfriend. Fakudze said a fight ensued after the confrontation with

the person who was claiming ownership of his girlfriend. Dube said he ended up being involved in the skirmish because he was trying to help his friend who was being assaulted. He said he ended up being stoned by the complainant. Dube said the complainant was the one who was violent as he even assaulted police officers when he found them (Fakudze and Dube) while they were at the police station being charged.

The magistrate condemned the accused persons' act of violence. He sentenced Fakudze to 18 months imprisonment for each count with a fine option of E2 000, which means he will have to part with E4 000 to gain his liberation.

This was after explaining that he (Fakudze) was provoked after someone tried to grab his girlfriend inside the bar. The magistrate told the top referee that he should have talked to his girlfriend instead of assaulting the complainant. The magistrate noted that it is clear by her action that Fakudze's girlfriend 'yintfombi yasetjwaleni', he said the referee should have asked her that it looks like she

is for the whole world (sandanezwe) as the interpreter put it. Hence she should be the one that the accused was supposed to talk to and ask who she was really with.

Magistrate Dlamini told the referee that he is 43 years old and looking at his age it is assumed that the referee's mental capacity is supposed to be matured, but by the look of things the referee is the most violent person as he assaulted two people at the drinking spot.

Fakudze was charged with two counts, which was that of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm and assault common and for each count the referee was sentenced to 18 months imprisonment with a fine option of E2 000.

'Rubber' slapped with E20 000 fine for assaulting Mkhonta

SOCCER - MBABANE Citizens official Bheki 'Rubber' Simelane has been hit with a E20 000 fine by the Premier League of Swaziland (PLS) for assaulting executive member Sicelo Mkhonta.

Simelane is accused of having assaulted Mkhonta, who is also a Director of Manzini Sea Birds, at the Somhlolo National Stadium on May 13 after the National First Division (NFD) championship decider between Citizens and Sea Birds. Sea Birds won that match 2-0 to clinch the NFD title and the E120 000 first prize cheque.

In a letter dated May 16 and titled 'Re: Summary Fine for Misconduct by Bheki Simelane,' the PLS informs Citizens and Simelane of the fine.

"Mbabane Citizens is hereby summarily fined E20 000 for violent misconduct in that on the 13th of May 2018 at Somhlolo National Stadium, the accused team's official and/or supporter Bheki Simelane assaulted the PLS Executive Member Mr. Sicelo Mkhonta. The PLS has invoked Article 7 (2) of the 2017/18 MTN National First Division League Rules and Regulations," part of the letter, which this publication is in possession of, reads.

Article 7 (2) states that, "Notwithstanding, the provisions of Article 7(1) above, the PLS reserves the right to charge any player, official, marshal, supporter, fan, spectator positively identified by the Referee or Match Commissioner or PLS official to have contravened any of Article 7 (1) and if found guilty he/she shall be punished ion accordance with NFAS constitution and/or the NFAS rules and regulations or the NFAS disciplinary code," the letter concludes.

Contacted yesterday, Simelane refused to comment much on the matter.


"No, I haven't received any letter. I have no idea. I don't want to comment on it," Simelane briefly said. Citizens will also be hit with a E3 000 fine by the PLS for failing to follow instructions of match officials at Somblolo during that match against Sea Birds.
