BUCOPHO MURDER SUSPECT ARRESTED

ardly two days after the murder of KaMfishane Bucopho Thoko Maseko, police yesterday made a major breakthrough by arresting a suspect aged 38 in connection with the case.

Police are said to have followed leads into Maseko's disappearance and murder which led them to one Sonnyboy Shane Harris (38) of the same area.

Maseko went missing on Sunday and it is said her relatives last saw her alive when she left for church and never returned.

The search that started immediately was halted only on Wednesday when the search party stumbled across the body which was covered with shrubs and tree leaves.

It is said Harris, a neighbour and closely related to the deceased family, addressed each other as 'cousins and was arrested on Thursday evening just at around 7pm at Malindza in an area known as Mbadlane in the Lubombo

Unconfirmed

There are still however unclear explanations as to how he got to be in that area.

Unconfirmed reports allege that he had gone there to seek help from a powerful traditional healer with the aim of assisting him to be cleansed or helped not be linked with the case.

Others said he went to see the invanga for cleansing after killing the old woman. It is said Harris also told police the reason that led to him killing Maseko was that she practiced witchcraft but these are just allegations reportedly to have been told to the police when he was questioned on what made him to kill her. It is said he strangled her and when doing this, it is said he wore hand-gloves.

It is said yesterday; Harris led the investigating police officers to the scene and further showed them other items including the clothes he was wearing as well as where he hid the gloves.

By noon yesterday, the police were still being shown around the spot/s which were needed to be included as part of evidence.

He allegedly cooperated and made the police work easy.

Indvuna of KaMfishane (Zishinini) Umphakatsi the area Sam Ndlangamandla also confirmed that police had arrested a suspect.

He said he also heard that it was someone known in the area but the reasons why he killed the woman; he said were still being investigated

Confused

"At least there is to be a sigh of relief as all along we were clueless and all of us were confused as to who it could be. I know the suspect as they were almost neighbours with the deceased," said Indvuna Ndlangamandla.

Meanwhile, other reports are that another issue linking Harris to the murder, is an article he wrote in one of the dailies Letters to the editor column of November 5, 2018 where he was indirectly him accusing the old woman for having been Bucopho for almost three terms and this was more evidence allegedly linking to the murder. Police mouthpiece Supt Phindile Vilakati confirmed that a man aged 38 was on Thursday evening arrested in connection with the murder of the Bucopho.

"It is true that we now have a suspect and we are still trying to collect more evidence," said Supt

I'm a victim of sexual harassment - US Ambassador

S Ambassador Lisa Peterson in an effort to encourage students to break the cycle of violence yesterday at the University of Eswatini (UNESWA) revealed she was once a victim of sexual harassment and regrets not filling a formal complaint in fear of retaliation from

She said she had at that time taken the first step by reporting the incident to the office responsible of handling such cases.

The ambassador's disclosure was made during the launch of the 16 Days of Activism against Gender based Violence against Women and

In fact, the launch venue (UNESWA) and the ambassador's statement comes at a time when a university female student is fighting for justice after allegedly being raped by a prominent prince and his friend in September.

Despite having reported and opened a case against her alleged assailants, to date nothing has been done and police are reported to have engaged on a never ending investigation, something that led to an online petition being set-up called: Say No to Rape: Arrest Swazi Prince for rape. Equality before the law: Justice for the victim."

By late last night about 2 450 people had signed the online petition, which seeks to get 2 500 signatures.

Yesterday students started the day with a demonstration around campus before joining other delegates at the seminar during the launch of the International Day of the Elimination of Violence against Women and Children which starts tomorrow and ends on Human Rights Day, on December 10th.

Movement because charges of sexual harassment. On her regrets the ambassador said: "if I had overcome my fears 30 years ago, maybe the campus culture at my university would have started changing

The US ambassador said students need to know the tools of how to ensure justice when an act of violence has occurred.

Peterson said: "Justice and accountability for crimes now will be part of what prevents them in the future. You

must know your rights; act against abuse and please don't look away. If you become aware of an abusive situation, support the person who is suffering the abuse. And if you yourself are experiencing abuse, find the tools to hold your abuser accountable.'

The Worldwide campaign marking the 16 Days of Activism against Gender based Violence started in 1991 and is now in its 27th year.

The US Ambassador commended

the efforts of Eswatini organisations to commemorate this period and stated that numbers grow in both number and scope. She said even the UNESWA seminar was an example of how the campain's efforts have been increasing.

The ambassador also noted the role of the media in informing the nation on where such incidents and reports of violence

take place at different homes in the country.

Peterson also disclosed her sadness on noting that women may have no more safety in the workplace than they do at home.

She further stated that intimate partner's violence, stalking, assault, rape and harassment happen in the workplace every day around the world.

She said this has an impact not only

Public transport system also a challenge

S Ambassador Lisa Peterson sharing with UNESWA students encouraged the discussion never to forget that the public transport system is a gauntlet of both physical and verbal harassment.

Peterson disclosed her displeasure: " how productive do you think a woman can be going to work if she had to start her day with a kombi conductor or fellow passenger putting his hands wherever he wants?"

She said that can become a pretty depressing discussion pretty quickly.

The US ambassador was also full of praises saying the past year had been positive in Eswatini.

Peterson said civil society groups showed incredible organisational effectiveness by flooding the gallery of the House of Assembly in the final days of the debate on Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Bill.

She said they were able to persuade MPs to withdraw objections to the Bill. She praised them for mounting a concerted campaign using personal contact, advocacy through the media and public marches when appropriate, to build support for the Bill and respond to people's concerns.

The ambassador said: "even as we celebrate passage of the SODV Act real victory only happens when the Act is actually used to bring perpetrators of violence to justice. The good news is that magistrates and prosecutors have swung into action, moving quickly to put this law into action, to such an extent that they've been authorised to work on weekends to address the large number of cases.

ing allowances sparingly to last the semester.

"They become virtual call girls. There is hardly a way to complain if shortchanged, that is if the client refuses to pay. Most of them do it to boost their wardrobe and outshine colleagues. They also do it for prospects of finding employment where these giant 'daddy cools' hold high positions.

"Survivors of domestic violence are likely to have higher rates of absenteeism due to health problems and legal cases directly related to violence," adds the ambassador

The ambassador shared with students that there is a need to reach into all areas where gender-based violence occurs and push for systematic change and accountability. Peterson said efforts against gender based violence cannot stop at the edge of the family compound or homestead. She further encouraged students "it is fitting therefore that we are here, at an institution that is itself a place of work, but also an entity preparing people for the world of work.

The ambassador minced no words when she stated that violence contributed to the high rates of new HIV infection amongst young women, who generally lack the tools to defend themselves from unwanted sexual

The ambassador also said "according to UNICEF, one in three females has experienced sexual abuse by age 18. 48 per cent of Emaswati women report having experienced some form of sexual violence in their life

MHLUME MP WANTED OUT

group of disgruntled people under the Mhlume inkhundla are pursuing a giant case in their bid to remove their own Member of Parliament (MP) Victor Malambe two months after the national elections claiming he does not belong to their constituency but an entrant from Mhlangatane.

The bitter residents were found at the Simunye Police Station this week where they had gone to sign affidavits supporting their claim in preparation for a court battle.

Other similar attempts have failed in the past, with Elections and Boundaries Commission Chairman Chief Gija claiming that such a claim can only be contested during the viewing of the voters' roll and anything past that period is of no force and effect.

The residents claim Malambe never qualified for the nomination as he did not adhere to all the laws governing elections that require an individual to be a resident of the area for at least six months as stated in the Elections Act of

On the other hand, Malambe said he was not intimidated by a certain clique of sour losers who cannot accept defeat.

"I was duly elected and I will continue to serve the interest of my Inkhundla in parliament. I've been doing business in the area for more than 15 years. I don't only have official residence in Mhlume but also own businesses in the

The residents claimed that they launched a complaint with the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) where they were given the go ahead to approach the highest courts of the land.

The residents converged at the Simunye Police Station in their bid to register their disgruntlement on the election of what they termed a non-resident as Member of Parliament.

Residents alleged that the MP was using them as a ladder to be an MP, claiming he was last seen at Simunye when he was pronounced the winner.

Provocation

Malambe refuted such allegation as witch-hunt and provocation aimed at making his work difficult.

He said he was not going to be intimidated in the execution of the aspirations of the loyal people of Mhlume just because of a few disgruntled individu-

The residents said they were looking at triggering the importance of the court's independence even for issues that touch on the power of recall laws for any person found guilty of serious wrongdoing. The residents said through their investigation they had unearthed a lot of loopholes deliberately ignored by the EBC officers overseeing the elections.

The residents demand for the investigation and arrest of the presiding and returning officers, as well as those who were imisumpe for deliberately ignoring the laws governing elections.

The disgruntled residents said justice must prevail in ensuring those who lied having been given the mandate to vet those who are residents or not should be arrested for lying, something that led to the nomination of the MP.

They said their case was water tight and there was no dispute that they were cheated on the controversial election of the Member of Parliament as his wife (Khanyisile Malambe) stated clearly that she was from Mhlangatane.

Fairly

The residents stated that they anticipated the courts to fairly hear their case as evidence is in Senate.

The residents alleged that they had investigated and found that the MP was never a resident of the constituency.

The residents said their prayers were now with the courts to grant them their wish to have an MP who will know their needs and will be available to get a mandate to represent them in parliament.

The residents who were from different areas within the constituency stated that the last time they saw their MP was on the day he was declared a winner at Simunye.

The residents said they had investigated and found that he was never a resident of Simunye and the surrounding

"We want justice to prevail on this case and we have the evidence and people are willing to testify on many allegations that was employed to elevate him to parliament. We also have a classic example that can be used by the courts with his wife known to be from Mhlangatane, which is in the Hhohho region yet Mhlume is in the Lubombo region," said one resident.

E13 000, cow for Mafucula voters to feast

Some Mafucula residents who now seem to have changed their mind about the choice of MP they elected claimed they were treated by being showered with gifts and material during the campaigning stage of the national elections.

The residents, some of whom are those who are calling for the nullification of the Mhlume Inkhundla vote, claimed MP Victor Malambe gave their associations money and donated building material during the campaign.

He is alleged to have given 13 associations E1 000 each and contributed E5 000 for beast that was slaughtered for the community during his mini-campaigns. The residents further alleged that Malambe in a jovial and philanthropic mood also donated 60 bags of cement bags and 12 buckets of paint to Mafucula school. Part of the donation which was meant for the clinic was rejected by a senior sister-in-charge who said she could not accept any donation in the area but anyone willing to do so must visit the ministry of health. men and women who converged at the police station claimed they recalled vividly what they were promised by the aspiring MP at the time. "Taking advice from the King that we shouldn't be intimidated by people who will bring monies to lure us to vote for them, we adhered to His Majesty's advice to take their gifts but do the right thing in choosing our good candidates of choice at the ballot box but with bribery very rife in our area it was not to be as the numbers where he was nominated swelled. Kombis from outside this area were filled with voters to vote here." adds another resident.

Accept election defeat

P Victor Malambe advised residents not to be used by people who lost on the elections and allow the process of developing the Inkhundla a chance.

He said he was aware of the people who are busy trying to influence those who are not aware of the laws of the land.

"I have no worries with the way I was elected and the few that didn't win must accept defeat and allow residents to engage with their MP on the strategies to develop the Mhlume Inkhundla which has a potential to influence the national strategies for food security," adds Malambe.

MP Malambe further disclosed that he had been doing business in the area for 15 years and was aware of the challenges faced by everyone who was a resident.

He said a majority of residents are formed by people who come from all walks of life in the four regions for business and employment opportunities.

"It's unfortunate for some people to then claim I'm not a resident having been operating businesses in the area for more than 15 years," adds Malambe. Malambe said he does not dispute that

he comes from Mhlangatane, but the Elections Act allows an individual to choose where they wish to register to vote or be voted provided they quali-

"As someone who lives and owns several properties including conducting business within the Mhlume Inkhundla I qualified to vote and be voted in this constituency. My wife chose in her own right to vote under the Mhlangatane Inkhundla and that doesn't make it a crime. "What is interesting as well, is that if this were genuine concerns from the electorate, and my competitors they should have objected then, not now that I was elected and declared a winner," he said. With regards to the allegations that he was not visible in the community, MP Malambe stated that everyone knows that at the moment Inkhundla has not yet started operations, as there a lot of preparatory meetings and inductions still being done by authorities.

"I had vowed to the people of my constituency that once business starts I will avail myself at the inkhundla on days When I am expected to be there like Tuesdays I find it insincere that I would be expected to visit communities now," he said.



238 graduate at Christian University

bout 238 students graduated from the Eswatini Medical Christian University (EMCU) yesterday following the move by the Eswatini Higher Education Council to officially accredit programmes offered by the University.

The battle for recognition has not been easy for the university as it was last year forced to halt operations after a misunderstanding with government.

However, after signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Government of Eswatini in April 2018 everything became smooth.

The University's Vice Chancellor Professor Whan Kim when addressing those who attended the graduation ceremony at Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre made it clear that after three years their programmes have passed the acid test, saying this is a remarkable achieve-

Professor Kim said the programme evaluation exercise; sanction by Eswatini Higher Education Council in June was carried out by independent academic experts, professors and well known uni-

versities in South Africa.

The Vice Chancellor said on the basis of the said report parents, graduates and potential employers be advised that EMCU has been granted authority to

continue to operate in terms of Section 19 of the Higher Education Act of 2013. The Vice Chancellor said to date they have offered training in health related programmes including Nursing Science, Pharmacy, Radiography and Psychology.

What was also remarkable about yesterday's graduation is that the Computer Science and Social Work programme were represented for the first time.

He said their programmes are a response to specific needs in the health sector in the country and they still subscribe to purpose of higher education in the development of an individual.

He said it is their desire to create prepared minds and to stimulate research for the truth. Prof. Kim said preparation of the youth for productive contribution through character development is the main reason for their existence. Prof. Kim said the over 200 graduates may not all be absorbed in the public or private sector but they have been empowered with skills to start their own business ventures or sell their skills in other countries beyond Esv atini.

He said the staff got a handle on the situation despite the challenges and today the university's seven programme have been officially accredited by the regulator such as the Eswatini Higher Education Council

Prof. Kim said EMCU is a very young institution with humble beginnings but big dreams. He said they are appreciative of the partnership they have with government, he mentioned that the subvention they receive for operations is very low making it difficult for them to pay competitive salaries, including benefits to attract and retain highly qualified academic staff. The Vice Chancellor said over the six years of their existence, working out the budget of the institution has been as challenging as squaring a circle. "Having been given a new lease of life by the ministry of education through the Second Memorandum of Agreement, we humbly look forward to a subvention that will enable us to operate efficiently," Prof Kim said.

He added that there is a need to improve their facilities, particularly their laboratory and library space. He said it is for this reason that the African Continent Mission and Pastor Chong Yang Kim took it upon themselves to once again engage in a fund-raising drive for the construction of Pharmacy and Medical Science laboratories. Professor Kim said the institution is also exploring various avenues for raising funds for construction of students' hostels. He said this is because the present arrangement is not suitable.

Minister urges graduates to pay scholarship loans

The Minister of Education and Training Lady Howard-Mabuza has urged government sponsored students from the Eswatini Christian University to remember to pay back the loans and scholarships they were granted.

The minister was speaking at Mavuso Trade and Exhibition centre yesterday during the institution's graduation ceremony.

She said as a ministry they are all aware that in recent times, funds have been hard to come by, and the very fact that there is a graduation ceremony means that they have been beneficiaries, directly or indirectly, from some source of funding. The minister said a lot of people have dug deep into their pockets and purses along the way to get where they are today.

"For those of you who did not have family members supporting you, be aware that you are going to have to pay back the loans and scholarship you were granted," Howard said. She said the graduands must pay back the money so that the next generation of students can be afforded the same support that they received. The min-

ister said it is worth noting that the Eswatini Medical Christian University is growing in leaps and bounds as in July about 190 candidates graduated from the University and she is reliably informed that a reasonable number has already found employment.

"A total of 233 graduates are expected to be conferred with degrees during this second graduation ceremony," the minister stated.

AUDIT DECRIES TENDERING PROCESS

PricewaterhouseCoopers financial audit of Matsapha Town Council has questioned the tendering process whether it was indeed appropriately followed.

Furthermore the audit noted that tender committee composition was sufficient and adequate for the execution of the duties of the committee. However there is no specific tender committee and the audit asks "is the process followed appropriate?" The tender committee composition would include the key people which would include the town treasurer, a representative from the department and an official from the purchasing department. On remittance of statutory contributions timeously the audit discovered that this was tested and no exceptions were noted.

On testing of cheque payments which were written out to junior staff members the audit noted that the supporting documentation for these transactions would be an internal memo. "We have recommended to management that more appropriate supporting documentation should be maintained."

On disposal policy; items which the former CEO left the council with, the audit reviewed the employee file of the CEO and noted that valuations of these items had been obtained from a computer hardware consultant.

These were the prices which were used to sell the items of to the former CEO.

On settlement of the study loan by the former CEO the audit found that this outstanding amount was settled by the CEO.

The audit inspected a proof of payment document which was evidence of this in the CEO's employee file.

There were other matters of interest that were not covered by the audit and again there are no reasons provided.

The review of the E100 000 matter report which was prepared by Kobla Quashie. Fakudze, then Matsapha Town Board CEO reported that she was robbed of the cash on March 9 2012 during a hijacking, near Lochiel, South Africa. Fakudze went to the bank the previous day to withdraw the cash for it to disappear the following day outside the country, a matter that also attracted the eyes of Senate when then Senator V Bhutana Dlamini raised it in the House but there were no answers, even to this day the Kobla Quashi report has not been made public despite this being a public institution. However Fakudze had claimed to have been in the company of three other junior staff members Nkosingiphile Tfwala (Accountant), Gugu Dlamini (Accounts Clerk) and Mduduzi Dladla (driver) when they were attacked enroute to Nelspruit driving in a BMW 318. The robbers drew guns before snatching the money. Actually the robbers only demanded that the ladies should give them the handbags where the money was kept.

Another matter that had not been covered during the audit is the AON amount which was paid out from African Alliance.

There are no available details about this transaction. The other involves engineering projects whereby the audit wondered: Are the recommendations from research processes/studies performed being implemented? The other involved staff position that are not clear. People who are performing the same job can be included under different employment ranks and earn different amounts. Grading does not follow a clear process.

On policies and regulations, staff standing orders: staff retention states, and educational polices, all of these were not covered. In the tendering process some tenders may be awarded to relatives instead of being awarded to the most deserving tenderer. Also, are background checks on tenderers done? On personnel auditing some staff members do not qualify for the positions that they are in. Many consultant studies were done but never implemented.

Internal control weaknesses

On property, plant and equipment a difference of E759 989.08 noted when comparing fixed assets per the trail balance and that per the fixed asset register, this was subsequently resolved on 27 September 2028. an annual basis in line with International Accounting Standards (IAS 16). Intangible assets were included in property, plant and equipment instead of being properly categorised as intangible assets. Intangible assets policy not in place. On cash and cash equivalents; the main bank account in the general ledger consolidate a number of bank accounts and that makes it difficult to monitor and effectively perform reconciliation.

The bank balances in the main bank account were not recorded at correct values but this was subsequently resolved. Transactions amounting to E67 500 in the council's bank statements not recorded in the cash book or general ledger, which was also subsequently addressed on 17 October.

Petty cash balance of E5 800 per the trail balance was not reconciled to the actual petty cash balance on hand. Unknown cash on hand balance of E26 000 included in the trail balance as at 31 March 2018.

On trade and other receivables; long outstanding debtor balances in trade and other receivance.

On trade and other payables; the council did not maintain a proper detailed listing to support amounts owed to suppliers at year end. The council did not reconcile supplier balances per supplier statements and supplier balances per the trial balances Long outstanding accounts payables balances not followed up and investigated by the council. Balances included in unallocated deposits account not aggressively followed up and resolved Unallocated deposits as at year end amounted to E475 128.65. On operating expenses cash and cheques were used for paying management for trips to be undertaken. Insufficient supporting documents maintained for cheque payments; and insufficient supporting documents maintained for cheque payments made in respect of entertainment allowances. On payroll, employee files not updated with changes relating to salaries. Payroll reconciliations were not prepared and reviewed on a monthly basis.

Noted

Differences were noted when recomputing PAYE for employees. Poor filing of overtime forms and other supporting documents. Management pensions remitted to AON not taxed. Differences were noted between monthly payroll variance reports. Manual journals not thoroughly reviewed prior to processing. On IT systems unknown automated entries posted in the general ledger accounts.

The council's staff members not properly trained on the newly introduced accounting system. The current IT policy document is outdated and will need to be updated-the current policy was created in 2014. The council does not have a formal backup restoration testing procedure. A postimplementation review and benefits realisation review for the new system was not performed. The council does not have a documented disaster recovery plan. Differences noted when comparing balances per the trail balance (per Samaras) and different modules in Samaras.

Union petitions NAMBOARD CEO, PS

mployees affiliated to the Swaziland Agricultural and Plantations Workers Union (SAPAWU) have petitioned National Agricultural Marketing Board Chief Executive (NAMBOARD) Siphephiso Dlamini for allegedly violating a collective agreement.

The petition in particular makes reference to the recent staff bonuses where some staffers are said to have taken home huge chunks while others got virtually nothing.

In the petition sent to the CEO on 26 July Secretary General Manqoba Dlamini states that "we have been reliably informed that your undertaking has continuously violated agreements entered to between yourselves, NAMBOARD and ourselves the recognised union SAPAWU. In that, to mention but a few, your undertaking has violated the Recognition Agreement by infringing on our union's right to collective bargaining in that you have continuously deprived the union its right



to negotiate terms and conditions of employment of employees in the bargaining unit of your undertaking and further selectively and discriminatorily effected wage increases to employees who are allegedly not members of the union, which is unjust."

The workers further state that the CEO violated the Recognition Agreement by changing terms of conditions of employment of the workers by paying them an ex-gratia payment and forcing them to agree or endorse poorer terms of employment.

They claim in their petition that changes in terms and conditions are supposed to be negotiated in line with Clause 4 of the recognition agreement. Tricking or forcing unsuspecting employees to unknowingly agree to poorer terms of employment is unethical and illegal.

The CEO is also said to have violated "principles of natural justice, fairness and equity by suspending employees for prolonged periods without advancing changes to the employees which defies the fundamental principles of resolving disciplinary issues, as they must be dealt with expeditiously while all facts surrounding the matters in question are still fresh in the minds of all involved.

"You would obviously note that justice delayed is justice denied," they stated.

He is accused of having violated the memorandum entered to between the union and his undertaking on 22 January at the Commission "where your undertook to cause the salary review to be presented to ourselves on or before the 16th February, five months later your undertaking has failed or refused to adhere to the memorandum of the agreement which is grossly prejudicial as there are other collective bargaining matters interlinked with the salary review."

Furthermore he is said to have violated the Employment Act of 1980 as amended on protection of wages by continuously deducting money from the wages of employees without a legal instrument or the consent of the employees, again to the prejudice of the employees and their families.

"Noting the prejudice caused by the unethical and illegal conduct by go your undedrtaking we are compelled to demand that you address these issues within seven days if not we will be forced to seek external redress which may include petitioning the undertaking's board and/or the ministry of agriculture and/or the courts on matters of rights or engage in industrial actions for matters of interest."

aving failed to address the issues raised by the workers in the July 26 letter the union has since written to the ministry of agriculature principal secretary complaining about the host of violations on the part of the CEO.

Last week Thursday the union wrote to the principal secretary requesting his intervention on "continuous violation of agreements entered between the union (SAPAWU) and NAMBoard; discriminatory payment of bonuses which as resulted in bad publicity of the organisation;

"We are seeking an audience with your office to address these among other issues at NAMBoard. We regard this as an urgent matter as we feel our job security as employees is threatened. We hope to get your best cooperation." This one was signed by Chairperson Sandile Mkhonta.

INSIGHTS INTO SIPA BOSS

Thile questions abound regarding the sudden withdrawal of a resignation letter by Chief Executive Officer at Swaziland Investment Promotion Authority Phumelele Dlamini, it has emerged that her performance from 2015 had been measured through the expectations of government's fiscal adjustment roadmap (FAR-2010/11-2014/15.

This also came after stinging criticism at the People's Parliament, Sibaya at Ludzidzini Royal Residence when His Majesty King Mswati had requested the nation to assist him choose a prime minister for the country. Insiders say her failure in particular to set a One Stop Shop for investors and the establishment of an Industrial Park were some of the issues around her performance. This was coupled with Eswatini's drop in the rankings of ease of doing business.

Swaziland is ranked 117 among 190 economies in the ease of doing business, according to the latest World Bank annual ratings. The rank of Swaziland deteriorated to

117 in 2018 from 112 in 2017. Ease of Doing Business in Swaziland averaged 116.09 from 2008 until 2018, reaching an all time low of 124 in 2011 and a record high of 108 in 2015.

According to FAR in the medium term, government was to streamline licencing arrangements to reduce the current number of days required for licencing and registration of businesses (from 21 to about two months, respectively) to seven days as well as implement the Investment code.

Incentives

In addition, government was also to implement a competition framework, the streamlined Companies Act and create incentives for labour intensive FDI to enter the market.

Such measures were to reduce the cost of doing business in Eswatini and complement policies that would reduce costs in ICT, open up the telecoms sector to competition, and expand power supply to provide business with the necessary infrastructure to support their activities. In this regard, it is said, the industrial park in Matsapha remains somewhat empty with no foreign direct investors coming in save for a cou-

ple of factory shells that house fertilisers.

SIPA has taken a leading role in reviewing the investment legislation framework. It had undertaken an audit on the implementation of the Investor Roadmap and had developed a strategy to address the outstanding issues. A draft investment policy had been prepared with the assistance of the USAID Trade Hub, for consideration by government.

Insiders say Dlamini at the helm of the organisation is having issues with just about everyone, from the board to the lowest member of staff as was evidenced with her face off

with cleaners based at the Mavuso Trade Centre in Manzini.

The result of this, according to insiders, no one wants to cooperate with her and most of her efforts are sabotaged deliberately. When she submitted her resignation last week

Last Friday it was ululation and celebration from all quarters but that was short-lived when she withdraw her resignation on Monday.

Interestingly no one seems to want to explain what this means, whether the board's reasons for the acceptance of her resignation fell off.

FAR also calls for need to put in place regulatory mechanisms that will protect investors in the country; this includes the need to create an independent regulator for competition in ICT to encourage reduction in costs and expansion in services. To this effect, government introduced a telecommunication regulator by 2010/11 and a fully operational energy regulator by December 2011.

This facilitates licencing the planned power plants (for 300MW and the private sector 28MW unit) and the potential LUSIP mini-hydro plants.

MONETARY POLICY STATEMENT 23 November 2018

n the 23rd of November 2018, the Central Bank of Eswatini (Bank), together with the Monetary Policy Consultative Committee (MPCC) held a meeting to consider the appropriate monetary policy stance for the Bank until the next meeting on 19 January 2019.

The Bank decided to maintain the discount rate at 6.75 per cent.

This monetary policy stance was found appropriate after considering international, regional, and domestic economic conditions, which would have an effect on the Bank's price and financial stability mandate.

Global growth forecasts for 2018 have been revised downwards to 3.7 per cent from 3.9 per cent. Financial conditions in advanced economies remain accommodative; however, they could rapidly tighten depending on developments in trade tensions, policy uncertainty, and the rising inflation in the USA.

Regionally, the South African economy is in a technical recession following that it shrank by a seasonally adjusted 0.7 per cent in the second quarter of 2018 after a 2.6 per cent contraction in the first quarter of 2018. Consumer prices increased from 4.9 per cent in September 2018 to 5.1 per cent in October 2018. Revised inflation forecasts were observed, and it is now estimated that inflation will average 4.7 per cent in 2018 (from 4.8 per cent), before increasing to 5.5 per cent in 2019 (from 5.7 per cent). The South African Reserve Bank assesses risks to long-term inflation to be on the upside.

On the domestic front, real GDP for Eswatini is projected to contract by 0.4 per cent in 2018 from 1.9 per cent in 2017, mainly due to ongoing government cash flow challenges and the anticipated negative impacts on domestic exports destined to South Africa due to the economic recession.


Annual headline inflation increased to 5.2 per cent in October 2018, from 5.1 per cent recorded in September 2018. The slight increase in consumer inflation was mainly driven by increases in the price indices for 'food and non-alcoholic beverages' and 'clothing and footwear'. The Bank's inflation forecasts for the fourth quarter have been revised downwards from the 5.59 per cent forecasted in September 2018 to 5.45 per cent due to declining international oil prices. Consequently, the Bank's forecast for 2018 is revised downwards to 5.17 per cent from the 5.21 per cent forecasted in September 2018.

Credit extended to the private sector depicted a month-on-month increase of 0.3 per cent to reach E14.4 billion at the end of September 2018. The increase was due to a rise in demand for credit in the Household and Business sectors. However, credit to 'Other sectors' contracted over the review period. Compared to the same period last year, credit extended to the Private Sector depicted an increase of 4.4 per cent.

Gross Official Reserves stood at E7.1 billion at the end of October 2018, depicting a month-on-month increase of 9.8 per cent. The growth was mainly due the quarterly inflow of SACU receipts during the month of October 2018. The Reserves were equivalent to an import cover of 3.3 months, an improvement from the 3.0 months observed in September 2018.

The Bank will continue to monitor developments that will influence the movements of inflation and reassures the public that it will act appropriately if there are significant changes to the inflation outlook. The Bank further reassures the public that the Bank's monetary policy stance remains supportive to economic growth.

TAIWAN DONATES WHEELC KING STICKS AND CANES


The Republic of China on Taiwan yesterday donated wheelchairs, walking sticks and canes to persons with disabilities in the country.

hieftaincy disputes prove to be a tactic used by silent power hungry individuals that use tensions in communities and later on try to act as the peace binding figures to legitimise their stay to the powers to be. Mahlangatsha community in the outskirts of Mankayane town learned the wrong way when community members fought in front of congregants during a funeral at one of the homesteads in the

Shocking as it may be, the fight was brewing all along following unknown summons that were delivered to the community leadership, allegedly orchestrated by a senior officer within the Royal Eswatini Police Services. The embarrassing situation is alleged to have happened when the family was about to lay to rest their departed family member, as per custom dictates that a representative of the community leadership needs to comfort the community and the family affected.

It is alleged that after a heated argument on the right to speak on behalf of the community leadership the two men almost exchanged blows, quick intervention of several men saved the situation from getting out of hand.

The community further told Observer on Saturday that a quick intervention of the pastor who was leading the funeral saved the day for mourners. The pastor is said to have decided that no community representative would say anything at the funeral as the two men were squaring-up and ready for a fist fight after their heated arguments over the right to speak on behalf of one of the community leaders.

The two men were separated by other mourners as they bared for each other's blood, a true patriotism for their chief of choice.

Tension was already brewing leading to the funeral, after controversial summons were intercepted and clarity being sought on its origins, as no complaint was launched at the local police station or at umphakatsi level save for reporting as per procedure of the funeral to take place in the area.

The community leadership issued with summons, trying to get clarity on their origin it is alleged they visited the Attorney General's office.

It is alleged the summons were traced and the officer who wrote them is said to have been unaware he was being used by the architecture of the summons. AG's office is said to be aware of the challenges of the continued abuse of their office by the two fighting individuals implicated in the summons saga. It is further alleged that they were told that if they wanted to approach the courts they must fork out their own money and engage private law firms for services.

The community felt the fight was uncalled for, as the area has so many families paying allegiance to different leaders but they have coexisted and accepted the way it is for a long time.

The community members disclosed that their area was another classic example of the massive work the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) needs to work on. They claim families and homesteads pay allegiance to different illegitimate leaders who cause unnecessary tension in the area yet their role is to work towards co-existence of communities in the land.

A senior police officer stands accused of sowing seed of infighting, with his power hungry tactics he is alleged to be attempting to legitimise his questionable community role having ditched his role with one of the community lead-

The senior officer alleged to have once erved as a key person of the very same leadership he disowned when he changed camp for reasons only known to himself, he is accused of causing havoc in the community.

Young people of the area warned the officer to refrain from his bad tactics as he is inviting trouble to himself on further dividing the community. The young people said the officer is causing unnecessary tension in the community whilst he is advancing his ulterior motives. "We understand he has backing of some of senior princes from the royalty and it's unfortunate that the kings name ends

up being dragged in the mad for evil ends of individuals," pleading one young person in the area.

The youth further blamed the senior officer, stating they were very angry seeing their parents fighting in front of them due to the divide and rule of the officer of the law. "We are very ashamed of the incidence that happened in our area and for it to happen at a funeral. It's even despicable to separate your elderly people you respect as your own parents just because one individual wants to achieve his own goals with a fighting community" adds one of the young people of the area.

The young people who spoke freely on the subject on condition their names are not revealed said

"We need peace in the community; the king has said this several times, he (police officer) cannot then make this community fight amongst itself because of his evil intentions. The people who were fighting at the funeral, we both regard and respect them as our own parents and we know them as people who come from the respected disciplined forces of the country, the officer must stop his evil deeds in the community because he is inviting trouble".

meeting that resulted in calling of the author of the summons to clarify on the summons.

It is after the meeting at the AG's office that the community leadership were told to ignore the summons and ensure that the funeral continue as planned after they were satisfied with the explaination of the leadership.

Who is the chief of Mahlangatsha, questions abound

The area has different small community dwellings that continue to grow and many people claiming to be their rightful

When a question was paused to many people they seem clueless and stated as a fact that they know Madzele Maseko but there is also Mlobokazi Fakudze who now claims to be the rightful chief of the area. They also said the small community also have people who claim to be ruled at eNgcoseni. The confusion is said to have been there for a long time but as a community they don't care as their main priority is to make ends meet with lack of employment opportunities.

The senior police officer is said to be at the centre of the crisis that has seen the area being on the wrong side of socio development issues.

The community members said the area had so many challenges to attract the media with fights of elders "we have no proper roads infrastructure, the ministry of works and transport abandoned a project they initiated for an important bridge that needs to be highlighted. We cannot be ruled by a controversial police officer who divides the community instead of uniting it"

Efforts to get a comment through the Police Information and communications (PICO's) office failed in a bid to follow the known procedures to get a comment for any member of the police service. The said senior officer was said to be engaged in strings of meetings. Observer on

Saturday was informed he promised to call something that never materialised at the time of compiling the story. Observer on Saturday wanted to know what informed the senior officer to launch a complaint through a letter said to have surfaced that ended up getting summons issued to the community leadership of Ensangwini. Observer on Saturday also wanted to know the jurisdiction of Mlobokazi and if he is indeed a chief of the area as per the letter, the other burning issue the publication wanted to know was questioning his act as amounting to abuse of power to issue summons without any member of the family having complained and why such complain failed to start at community level where a police station is available.

Landlord arrested for shooting tenant's boyfriend

Trying to rescue his tenant from her violent boyfriend has landed a landlord in trouble as he has been arrested for allegedly accidentally shooting the boyfriend in the foot.

The landlord Simon Bulawako Makhanya of Mahlabatsini in Matsapha has since been charged with attempted murder.

Makhanya yesterday appeared at the High Court where he filed an urgent application for bail before Judge Mbutfo Mamba.

Since his bail application was not opposed, he was granted bail by the court fixed at E15 000, E3 000 to be paid in cash at the government revenue offices and E12 000 shall be in a form of a surety.

According to the charge sheet, Makhanya is charged with attempted murder in that while at Mahlabatsini area he did wrongfully and unlawfully and with intent attempted to kill one George Matse by shooting him once on the foot with a 12 bore rifle and thus committed the offence.

Represented by Manzini based lawyer Ian Dupont of Zonke Magagula and Company law firm, Makhanya in his affidavit submitted that on the day in question, the complainant and his girlfriend were involved in an altercation at

his property which is rented by the complainant's girlfriend and he attempted to intervene after his tenant (complainant's girlfriend) had raised an alarm.

While attempting to mediate in the dispute Makhanya submitted that the complainant assaulted him without provocation and that is when he retrieved his rifle and fired warning shots in the air in an attempt to put a stop to the assault on himself (Makhanya) and his tenant.

Makhanya submitted that the complainant was undeterred by this and continued to assault his girlfriend and he (Makhanya) warned him against such.

"The complainant then charged towards me, attacked me and tried to wrestle with me for the firearm and in the scuffle that ensued, the firearm was discharged and shot the complainant on the foot, it was never my intention to shoot the complainant," Makhanya submitted.

He told the court that he shall plead not guilty to the offence of attempted murder as he did not commit same.

He submitted that he is 76 years old, married and has 12 children who are dependent on him as his wife is unemployed and also dependent on him.

MAN (60) SLEEPS AT POLICE STATION BENCH FOR HIS ARREST FOLLOWING DAY

fter hearing news that he was wanted by the police, a 60-year old man walked to the Manzini Police station where he slept on the bench as he was not attended to until he was arrested the following day.

Charged with the rape of an 11-year old girl, Sipho Maziya arrived at the Manzini police station and informed the officers that he had heard that he was wanted and enquired the details of what he was wanted for.

However the police he found told him that the officers who were looking for him were not there and he decided to sleep over until the following day.

"I slept at the Manzini police station on the benches at the reception until I was attended to the following day where I was charged with the offence of rape," he said.

Maziya yesterday filed an urgent application for bail at the High Court as he has been charged under the newly enacted Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act of 2018.

He walked to the police station to enquire what he was wanted for, did not find officers looking for him, slept over until attended to following day
He was later charged for rape of 11-year old girl

Appearing before High Court Judge Mbutfo Mamba, the 60-year old was granted bail fixed at E50 000 as the bail application was not opposed, however the court ordered that he pays E3000 cash and E47 000 shall be in a form of a surety.

Unlawfully

According to the charge sheet, the 60-year old is alleged to have contravened the SODV act in that while in Manzini he unlawfully had sexual intercourse with an 11-year old juvenile.

The offence is accompanied by aggravating circumstances as envisaged by section 185 of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence (CPE) Act in that at the alleged commission of the offence the accused person did not use a condom thereby putting the complainant at risk of contracting sexually transmitted dis-

Appearing before High Court Judge eases and infections and further that the complainant is a minor.

According to Maziya in his founding affidavit, he appeared at the Magistrate court after his arrest pending his appearance before the principal magistrate where he was advised that he should move his bail application at the High

He submitted that he shall plead not guilty to the offence at trial because he did not commit same.

He further stated that he is a married man who has nine children five of whom are still attending school and averred that the matter is urgent in that he is currently detained at the Zakhele Correctional facility as he has been deprived of his personal right to liberty. Maziya was represented by lawyer Sabelo Bhembe in the matter.

ROBBERY SUSPECT APPLIED FOR BAIL REDUCTION

robbery suspect yesterday successfully filed an urgent application for reduction of his bail amount at the High Court. Sicelo Shakes Gamedze in his application pleaded with the court to reduce his bail amount as he could not afford the E5 000 he was ordered to pay in cash.

bail fixed at E50 000 and was to pay E5 000 cash and E45 000 was to be in a form of a surety.


Reduced

Gamedze of Kashoba area in the Lubombo region submitted in his papers that on September 15 2017 he was granted bail fixed at E50 000 by the High Court and ordered to pay E5 000 cash with the rest in a form of a surety.

However since then he submitted that he has failed to raise the E5 000 as he cannot afford to and whilst awaiting trial, he is desirous to be released on bail.

He informed the court that he has no previous conditions and that it has taken long for his trial to be expedited adding that there is nothing to suggest that he will abscond trial upon his release from custody.



Man who stormed class, speared pupil to death granted E15 000 bail

he man who made headlines when he stormed a classroom full of grade seven pupils and speared a pupil to death was yesterday granted bail by the High Court.

Thabiso Dlamini (31) of Kashoba area under Chief Sibengwane was granted bail fixed at E15 000 by the High Court, however since his bail was unopposed by the crown, he was ordered to pay E3 000 in cash and E12 000 shall be in a form of a surety.

Dlamini is charged with murder in that he unlawfully and intentionally killed a grade seven pupil Melusi Gamedze (17) by stabuing him with a sharp object on the back and did thereby committ the offence of murder at Kashoba area.

Represented by Siteki based lawyer Mongi Nsibande, Dlamini submitted in his affidavit that this is an application in which he seeks to be admitted to bail and having a confession made in the Siteki Magistrate court before a senior Magistrate on October 3 2018 be declared constitutionally invalid while awaiting trial at the High Court, According to Dlamini, he submitted



that on October 2 he was arrested by the Siteki Police for the offence of murder and was arraigned at the Magistrate court where he was told that he would be on remand pending his trial at the High Court.

He told the court that the deceased was involved in a sexual relationship with his lawfully wedded wife of six

years and that he once reported the matter to the local authorities at Kashoba who converged a meeting but were unable to make the schoolboy stop visiting his wife at their matrimonial hane when he (Dlamini) was away during the week since he was working for DTM Construction.

"There were rumours doing rounds

that the deceased was planning to kill me after our meeting with the local authorities held in June on this fateful day I went to the deceased's school to report him to the teachers with the rumours that I would be killed, I carried a short spear hidden under my jacket just in case I was attacked along the way and I went straight to the deceased's classroom where I waited outside," he submitted.

Mission

He told the court that while outside the grade seven classroom, a certain teacher attended to him and he told him his mission but the teacher refused to call the deceased outside and deemed such an act as unfair.

"I managed to get inside the classroom and saw the accused staring at me and went straight for him and a scuffle ensued as he could tell I was carrying a weapon, we wrestled and he unintentionally got stabbed, he was able to escape through the window," the murder suspect submitted.

He told the court that he is desirous to be admitted to bail whilst awaiting trial and that he has no previous convictions hence there is nothing to suggest that he may evade trial. He informed the court that he was working for a construction company DTM Construction (Pty) Ltd a company sub contracted to Inyatsi Construction and was attached to Ndobandoba at Big Bend adding that chances are high that the company will not engage him again hence he shall search for a new job.

Pupils at St Holly Ghost Primary were left in total shock after one of their peer was speared to death right inside a classroom in October.

The 17-year-old boy who is said to be a grandson to the late KaShoba Chief was allegedly having an affair with the wife of the accused.

The spine chilling incident occurred at a time when the Grade Seven pupils were preparing for their external examinations.

The school is situated near Ngcina, a rural area in the Lubombo region and Dlamini from the same area is said to have stormed the school and demanded to see the pupil from a teacher.

He accused the schoolboy of allegedly having affair with his wife.

According to some teachers at the school, Dlamini was armed with a spear and appeared to be in an uncompromising mood as he stepped into the school premises.



Residents of kaTfwala in Fairview outside Manzini are organising a neighbourhood watch to crack down on the fast growing business of the addictive drug, *nyaope*, sold at strategic spots near a homestead in KaTfwala.


Apart from the growing numbers of the drug dependent community, mainly youths, this has resulted in the rise in housebreaking and mugging cases in the surrounding settlements.

Our investigations have revealed that distributors of the now popular drug obtain it from a homestead in Fairview South then relocate to KaTfwala where they are identified with bibs at specific corners.

There is also a homestead known to be yet another source where the baron directs customers to where they can dispose of their goods and bring the cash to obtain a fix at E50.

An average person to get 'high' needs three fixes but may supplement the state of being high with dagga (cannabis) which is also equally easily available at nearly every corner in kaTfwala, which is also populated with shebeens that sell anything from opaque beer to the most potent Mozambican whisky tontonto.

A member of the community police group from nearby Makholweni, who preferred not to be identified, said moves were already at advanced stages to stage raids and catch the



nyaope distributors with the product with a view to enforce prosecution. He disclosed that the idea was to at least root out the drug from the area altogether probably for it to be sold elsewhere other than Fairview North, Fairview South, kaTfwala and Makholweni.

Valuable

He said the ring is spreading fast because it would seem it is more lucrative to sell *nyaope* than dagga because people are able to part with valuable goods for small sums of money and dispose of these items at market prices.

A fix does not last long enough and requires a boost every now and then at E50 a fix while dagga fetches only E15 for a box of matches and can be taken over a number of days.

Just this week a middle aged man of West African origin disposed of his large flat screen TV for a paltry E300 which he had bought for cash at E7 000, bringing with him all the papers as proof of ownership. He was again back in the evening begging to be given on credit promising to bring other household goods when his wife was away.

"Most of the young men who bring expensive goods here come from wealthy families especially Coates Valley. They stick around the street corners to have their fix thus also recruiting other age mates from the area to try the drug. In this way it is spreading fast here at a time we were also worried about the growing number of alcohol outlets.

There is drinking spot everywhere, from bars to bottle stores and shebeens. Nearly one in four homesteads at KaTfwala sells either alcohol or dagga. This has to stop," said the Makholweni source.

He even mentioned that his community police grouping recalls the time of former Cabinet minister Mntonzima Dlamini who used to support the community police of Makholweni in order to maintain peace.

It is alleged that the police post at Fairview North near St Paul's Methodist Church, Moyeni shopping complex, is ill-equipped and short staffed for the large areas of Fairview, Makholweni, Nkhundleni and as far as Mpholi.

Distributors

Often a time, he alleged, the police would rather look the other way than confront the problem especially because when the junkies are without a fix they scratch and scream on the roadside asking for donations and pointing at either the particular homestead or the distributors who openly demand cash.

By 2015 Hhohho Anti-Drug Unit's Mshiyeni Ephraem Maphalala claimed that Swazi addicts had developed the science of manufacturing their own *nyaope* but the one at KaTfwala seems to be a cut above the average. He told the public that drug addicts mixed dagga with ARVs (antiretroviral pills) and Ratex to come up with their own version of the nyaope, originally a South African fashioned drug.

Last year one Linda Tsabedze of Bhekinkhosi stole from his sister valuable items amounting to E40 000, that included a Toyota engine (E5 000), tractor grass cutter E10 000, brush cutting machine, refrigerator, car doors, fence, plates and blankets all just to finance the purchase of nyaope.

Just recently residents say a young man from Coates Valley stripped to the body all the parts of his brand new 2018 Golf GTI referred to as the Golf 'hot' hatch, part by part, to purchase *nyaope* from the kaTfwala baron

This had been a birthday gift from his parents. Another boy from the same area came with a ZTE Blade V8 Pro (32GB) 5.5", a Black Diamond valued at over E3000 for a paltry E150 for three fixes.

The size of a fix is no bigger than a grain of rice it is smoked by using a metal straw and by heating the cocktail of ingredients and inhaling the fumes. It is believed that the ingredients are a cocktail of antiretroviral drugs, milk powder, rat poison, bicarbonate of soda and pool

Nyaope made a name for itself between 2000 and 2006 in the Tshwane townships of Soshanguve, Attridgeville and Mamelodi in South Africa before breaking boundaries and borders to neighbouring countries.

It resurfaced around Durban in 2010 before spreading like wildfire throughout South Africa. Initially users feel euphoric or, when using heavier doses, a wonderful sense of relaxation, but the effects soon wear off and another hit is required. For some the less pleasant side effects include a painful stomach, muscle cramps and generally feeling really ill, but when these ease up, they use again.

Symptoms

Experts say just using it once is enough to get users hooked - similar to heroin addiction. Withdrawal is said to be especially harrowing and include symptoms of stomach cramps, insomnia, diarrhoea and vomiting.


Users also report that, when using nyaope, they can go for days without eating, which in turn weakens their immune system and makes them vulnerable to infection.

In rthe case of kaTfwala the nyaope junkies usually invade shops around the city to steal bread, cheeses, polony or other soft groceries which they munch on the roadside in groups when hungry. This has led to the drug also finding its way into the Manzini city centre.

Nyaope users in Eswatini are also covered by programmes sponsored by Country Coordinating Mechanism (CCM) and are classified as KAP, key affected population.

According to Global Fund KAP experience significant disease burden, restricted access to services, and limitations on their human rights.

Any group which meets the three criteria above can and should be considered a key affected population, and therefore deserving of tailored disease response programmes.

RA MANANGA BORDER DEVELS ABITTER PILL FOR RESID

swatini Revenue Authority (ERA) infrastructure development at the Mananga border has been described as a curse curtailing residents from making honest livelihoods by selling to road users.

They complained bitterly about lack of assistance in the form of restrooms and space for doing business ever since the demolition of the properties that provided such at the border. The demolition gave rise to the current state of the art facility that is now seen as a curse to residents of Mananga and Malibeni surrounding areas.

Residents and vendors decried that they were barred from using the restrooms at the newly built structure. They complained that every development must give room for those who had previously occupied that piece of land.

The residents disclosed their unhappiness with the treatment from officials delegating them as lesser beings for asking for assistance at the newly

"We are told the facility is meant for people who are crossing the border and passports are demanded from us to access the restrooms. We don't understand if the development was meant for us or for those with means to travel to neighbouring South Africa," adds a concerned resi-

As if the development is not an improvement

to the lives of the people, the informal business people are not happy with the curse the project has turned to be to their livelihood. The infrastructure at the border has shown the ugly dangers of development in the lives of people affected by big development projects. The project is seen by the informal traders as means to push them further to dungeons of poverty.

Mananga informal businesspeople disclosed to Observer on Saturday team that they had been hugely affected such that their informal businesses were now being systematically removed from the area. Currently the now operational border development has forced the relocation of the informal bus terminal to a small congested area.


Disregarded

The booming business area that used to make means to fight poverty amongst local entrepreneurs is turning to be a business area for government and nothing has been done to give the indigenous businesses a decent place to operate.

However it must not be disregarded that before the businesses moved away from the site they were duly compensated save for the small man selling vegetables, fruits and other smaller items.

The businesses are now crowded in one area where groceries, street vendors and buses are in one undeveloped section closer to the cliff of the Nkomazi River.

A non-governmental organisation (NGO) Developmental Officer who shared her views

on condition of anonymity said "The attempts by government institutions to promote development often entails varying degrees of risk for some sections of society as it is the case with the Mananga development. People have already been displaced and livelihoods disrupted. The development has been hard for the victims who are already impoverished, thus worsening their plight".

The officer further disclosed that the impact had been harsher for the people who live primarily off subsistence farming save for the few involved in the development of the sugarcane

Eswatini hospitals continue to face shortages in vital drugs, supplies

s many hospitals and medical centers across the country struggle to make ends meet, the ministry of health is still searching for solutions without the necessary resource finances.

Drug shortages in the country have gone way beyond just logistics and trying to source medication, the situation has become rather complex.

There is no change on the critical shortage of medical supplies in public health facilities across the country. Director of Health Dr Vusi Magagula confirmed that the situation was still the same as the country was facing financial challenges not only in the health sector. Dr. Magagula said as reported by the media even fuel was now rationed due to the fiscal challenges the country was facing. Magagula said the ministry was making purchases to satisfy the shortage temporarily with the bulk still a

Observer on Saturday in assessing the challenges faced by the health sector visited rural clinics, which also reported equal challenges just like the Mbabane government hospital that is now being supported by different donors to feed patients. The rural clinics reported to be servicing the key part of the populace including the poor communities that have no means for a choice of medical assistance but rely only on the clinics.

Residents disclosed that rural communities, unlike the urban dwellers, are not privileged with the choice and pharmacies for getting other health services because of poverty as well as lack of such services.

The heavy reliance on the local clinics is always the last resort for almost all poor communities in the country. Lack of key medical supplies to the local clinics has put a strain on the key service of the government for any ailment for the rural folks.

Nurses confided with Observer on Saturday their unhappiness with the dire situation currently being experienced by the health sector in the country. Nurses disclosed that while their profession did not allow them to voice their opinion on such issues as that can create public panic, the situation is calling for a nation-

Nurses at the visited clinics gave strong

warnings that failing to resolve such a key sector in the government machinery is like setting a time bomb.

"The population is suffering from a number of ailments and the need to put efforts on curative measures is still key than in other countries where they are working with their populace on the prevention strategies," warned nurses.

Assist

Nurses disclosed that rural clinics were strained more than the urban clinics, which are spoiled with choices for medical assistance, even with a lot of pharmacies for referrals to assist where medication and drugs are needed.

However, Dr Magagula said the country adopted the universal approach in delivering services in the country. He said what was happening at the government could not be compared with where someone was located, as the govemment is giving same services throughout the country with her health facilities. "Poverty or no poverty all our services are the same as it can be the case with urban dwellers. That's why we have same prices for all our health facilities to avoid separating people based on their geographic locations," adds Dr. Magagula.

The ministry's challenges with lack of medical supplies continue to be haunted, with a likelihood of diseases that will be resistant to medication.

Nurses said the rural health facilities were running out of remedies they can employ in the absence of effective medication and drugs for different ailments.

In the Lubombo region, nurses confided that requisitions for stock continue to be a challenge as drugs and medical supplies were returned with most of the crucial supplies not on the consignments. Nurses said the situation was so bad and was now affecting them on how they execute their duties as health

"We have been forced by the situation to abandon our patients to highlight the bad working conditions we are currently facing at the different government health facilities, not because we are bullies to the government but the situation is very worsening for health workers in the country," adds another

The nurse further pleaded with the government to prioritise health issues and solve the challenges of lack of crucial supplies stating the country cannot afford any outbreak of diseases at the

"The challenges that came with HIV has impacted a heavy burden into the health sector and it's still not yet resolved to let our systems fail us again," adds the concern nurse.

The nurse said it is dangerous for the country to have nurses who have adopted an attitude of accepting the situation as life will continue to be lost in the process.

"We have accepted the situation and we work with what we have which is very bad for the country. As nurses we should be motivated to assist our patients as there is nothing good in seeing your patient coming back to tell you they responded well to the medication you administered. We are in a rural area they come anytime to see us here, as well as give feedback on anything," adds the

Meanwhile, Magagula maintained that the situation has not yet changed and lack of resources has affected the whole government. Magugala said the ministry can only afford what it is currently offering at the moment until resources are available. Magagula said they once resources are available the ministry will ensure everything is back to normal.

POLICE GEAR UP FOR ERADICATING MURDER AND SUICIDE

In a bid to put a halt to murder and suicide in the country, thirty three(33) police personnel have been equipped with basic counselling skills as a tune-up to an upcoming media campaign aimed at curtailing this phenomena.

The two-day Basic Counselling Skills Training Workshop which was facilitated by the Institute Of Research Management and Development (IRDM) was held at the Matsapha Police Academy on Wednesday and Thursday last week. It was attended by psychotherapists, chaplains as well as officers from the DCS, Crime Prevention, 999 Emergency Response and PICO Units.

Speaking during the official closing, Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati who was representing the acting national commissioner of police applauded the Institute Of Research Management and Development for facilitating the capacitation of police personnel on basic counselling skills. She revealed that the existing relationship between the Police and IRDM dates back to time immemorial and it has contributed immensely in professionalising service delivery in the police Service. Vilakati urged participants to

use the knowledge and skills obtained from the workshop to professionalise and raise their counselling abilities so that those in need are helped. She also encouraged them to tune themselves for the upcoming Murder and Suicide Awareness Media Campaign stating that its success and effectiveness hinges on their unlimited commitment. She further urged them to share the knowledge obtained with their colleagues to ensure that a wider population of those in distress is reached.

IRDM's Oliver Tawada Museka stated that the purpose of counselling is to establish a treatment plan for the patient or victim. He revealed that for successful and therapidic counseling it is critical that one is well versed with the objectives of the counselling profession.

Speaking on behalf of the participants, Sergeant Sandile Shongwe expressed sincere gratitude for the opportunity to be capacitated on counselling skills. He noted that the public out there is in serious need for advice and help therefore the skills and knowledge obtained from the workshop will come in handy. He stated that the workshop exposed them to previously untapped phenomena and

othing was ever good enough for you, I tried to please you but you craved for more. You ignored my feelings and always satisfied yourself. Now that I am I was distracted by the pool of tears in my eyes.

Who was I to have expected love from a hopeless place. Everyone one was grown enough in my family to look after themselves. This is what my father would say.

I lived in a male dominated home. I was the only female in the family after the death of my step mother.

I had to give up school to become the house wife of my own father, to be mother to my own brothers.

My father had three sons of his own and his wife who recently died had three sons too, together they raised six sons and I was the only female. My father was one of a kind, he loved his daughter.

Never telt love so real and pure. He besotted his daughter. He loved her so much like his wife. That is what he claimed.

This was just an infatuation, this man was destroying his own daughter's life. How could I be so blinded by him. I hate myself. I will never forgive myself for being so uncommon. I believed in all his mysteries. Making things worse for me, my brothers would have me for breakfast lunch or whenever they felt like doing so. I felt more like a nobody.

I decided to leave home and go stay somewhere better but where? That was the loudest silent question filing my head. Any good samaritan in the street who would be probably looking for such children.

I left home and took a long route to town. On my way to our hometown a car stopped by tor a lift. I boarded the car and went with the beautiful lady in the car. She was too kind and was friendly to me. She asked where I was going with those big bags, I told her my story. She smiled at me and told me not to worry she would help me. What a relief since I did not know where I was going to.

Took

We went to a restaurant and had nice food. She took me to where she was staying and gave me a room to put my bags. She told me to prepare for a ride with her to get along well and know each other. Wow!! What a person. I felt warmth and welcomed. The atmosphere was too adequate for me, it felt more than too much.

She gave me beautiful nice clothes to wear and a sweet smelling perfume, I don't blame her though, and no one would actually go out with me in those clothes.

We went out and sat by her car, she looked at me with speaking eyes but did not say anything. She kept on smiling at me and asking where I was going to stay if it weren't for her kindness. I told her I would do anything possible for a living. "really?" she asked.

"Yes, anything, to forget the life I lived, either good or bad I would do." We got into the car. She took off and we went to her friend's house. Her friend was a woman of statue. She was hot. Real good looking.

I couldn't believe I would be one of them. Her friend eyed me with a quick glance then greeted her friend.

I lost my baby

ay name is NolwaziMndzebele. I was 19 years when I met my boyfriend Michael Bhembe* in 2000.

We dated for six months then he married me through the Swazi Law custom (kuteka). We were staying at his relatives home since he did not have his own parental home. His parents separated when he was very young and he was raised by his uncle and his wife. The family treated him like their own son, one could not realise that he was not their biological son. The woman who raised him liked me and treated me as her own daughter in law.

My relationship with my mother in law was very good but that lasted for two years. His younger brother got married and the supposed mother in law started to hate me. She used to call me a barren woman since I had not yet conceived and even said I was untidy and my food did not taste good.

Fortunately my husband noticed that I was no longer happy and he decided we build our own home 30 kilometres away from his parents' home. We were happy in that home until I fell pregnant four months later.

I was so happy I thought my husband felt the same way, unfortunately he was not because he had started dating other girls. Throughout my pregnancy my husband did not stay at home. I had no food and I was a sickly person. I used to go to his younger brother's wife to ask for food but because of the bad influence from the said mother in law she would not give me anything.

By the time I was due I had no money to go to hospital and even to buy clothes for my unborn baby. Luckily a neighbour gave me clothes that used to belong to her baby and as for napkins I had to tear sheets and improvise. The neighbour even borrowed me money to pay for my hospital bills.

My baby was six months old when my husband came home. He was drunk; I was surprised since I was unaware that he was into alcohol. He demanded to have sex with me without using a condom. The following day he accused me of cheating

on him and further said that I had infected him with lice. I told him that I had not cheated on him, but he would not listen instead he beat me until I pleaded guilty. Since both of us were infected by the sexually transmitted disease I had to find help and we were both healed.

By the time my baby was ten months I was already pregnant with my second child.

Things had gotten worse by then because my husband would bring his girlfriends home and ask me to either sleep in the same room and watch them as they had sex or take my baby and go to sleep in the kitchen which had no roofing.

During that time I was selling sweet potatoes and exchanging them for maize so that we could have something to eat. One of his girlfriends' came and demanded money from him, he in turn asked for the money from me. I told him that I did not have money but he beat me in front of his girlfriend, heavily pregnant as I was. I fell sick and I was admitted, unfortunately I lost that baby.

When I returned home I found that he was staying with another woman. He chased me out of our marital home, I refused but instead he threw all my clothes outside and I collected them one by one in tears and left unknowing where I was going to sleep with my daughter. I was hurt since I had no one to turn to because my parents died when I was young and I was raised by my aunt who was against my marriage from the start and had asked me never to turn back to her should anything happen.

I went to my neighbour and narrated my story, she let me stay with her for a week while I was looking for a job. My husband learned that I was staying with the neighbour and came to accuse her of destroying his family by teaching me adultery but luckily I did find the job as a house keeper and they even allowed me to stay in with my daughter.

I had always thought that my husband loved me and he would not let anything bad happen to me, but through his actions I have decided never to love any man in my life because they are soul destroyers.

My name is Sabsile Magagula*

was married to my husband who loved me so much. I was married through Swazi law and custom and my husband was working for government holding a senior position. When I got married, my mother in law did not like me, she wanted my husband to marry another woman from the area who is a teacher saying I was not working and had just come to finish her son's money.

Each time when my husband came home he was told different stories about me, he was told I hardly stayed home; I go in the morning and come back home late, I don't cook for them as expected from a daughter in law.

The sad thing was that my mother in law would not eat my food even when I had cooked, she only ate when my husband was around.

My step father in law would not say a word and when asked he would only agree with what my mother in law would say.

My husband realised this and decided that we leave his parental home and stay with him in town, we stayed together in town until we bought a piece of land where we built our own home without the knowledge of my mother in law.

When she got the news that we were moving into our new home, she visited us in town and insulted me saying I had come to snatch his son and had taken him to a place they didn't even know. She said I had bewitched my husband and even the three children we have were not his. I phoned my husband at work and he drove home. When my husband came she said I was chasing her away, asking her what she wanted in our house.

I was bold enough to explain to my husband what had happened, fortunately for me I had recorded some of the things she had said using my phone and I played it with everyone listening. Our six-year-old son was also there when all hell broke loose. When his father arrived he told him that mom was crying, when he asked why, the boy told him I was insulted by granny, this saved my day as there was evi-

dence that I wasn't at fault, but it was my mother in law who was on a mission.

My husband tried to talk to her and was told he was not man enough; he had been bewitched and needed to see a traditional healer to neutralise the entire juju in his system. After a lengthy discussion, it transpired my mother in law was not ready to listen to anything except wanting his son back home and told us she wanted his son to marry the woman from the area who is a teacher. My husband decided to go buy her groceries, give her money and drive her back home. On his way back from home, he was involved in an accident and died on the spot. I was informed by police in the early morning hours of the night he had died. When I called my in laws, my mother in law told me she did n't want to hear anything about him because I am the one who had killed him.

Came

On the same day they came and threw me out of the house, loaded all the household goods in our van and drove to their home living me in an empty house with my children because they claimed they didn't belong to their family.

Neighbours came, donated some blankets for me and some food parcels, I was grounded for the whole week without hearing anything from them and not knowing what to do next. After a week they came fetching for me, they found me in the house with my relatives and neighbours, they told me I am needed by my in laws because they were worried why I was not home when my husband had died.

I went there with my relatives, only to find that they had made funeral arrangements, tried to access the money from the bank and had failed, they went to the Master of High Court offices, only to find my husband had written a will and none of them was were in it, just only I and my children and his other brother's son whom we were taking care of.

He wrote on his will that when he died, he would be buried at our newly



built homestead. So when they failed to access the moneys they wanted that is when they called me and when I got there, they asked me if I knew anything about the plans of my husband. I just told them we were preparing to relocate to our new home and some of our belongings were already there and some livestock that we had already bought.

When they asked me about the will I never knew anything about it. They all stood their ground that they will not allow their son to be buried anywhere except his parental home. This went on for over a month before my husband was buried.

During all this, I was counseled by police from the child protection and domestic violence unit, social welfare department and some counselors from other NGOs and individuals.

This helped me a lot and I remained strong as I was getting support from outside.

There is a lot I cannot clearly elaborate through writing here, but my aim is to encourage someone out there that it is important to have a will because even the courts can easily decide on your case if there is a written will. I recovered all I had lost to my mother in law and I buried my husband where he wanted to be buried. Now I am able to take care of my children and I won the battle through courts, it was won very easily because my husband left a will.

Women, let us support each other in times like these because no matter how much your husband may support you, when he dies trouble starts and that is when you will see the real people who love you.

am a female of 31 years I lost my father who was a bread winner at home and have eight sisters we are all from different mothers. Our step mother left us alone after mourning my father's death.

The rest of my sisters knew their mother's places and they left two of us all by ourselves.

We had nothing to do but to seek for jobs by then I was twelve years old and my sister was fifteen. We believed we were going to be exposed to job opportunities if we were to go to Manzini. We did not have bus fare so we negotiated for rides from passing cars and we got one.

When we reached town we drew attention of a woman by the name of Mrs Motsa.

She asked why we were absent from school. We told her our story and she promised to hire one of us to do house chores in her house. She chose my bigger sister and said I should also come with them she was going to get me a job from her friends. Mrs Motsa was a hawker.

She introduced us to her husband and children. Our intention was to work and save money to go back to school. All the house chores were done by us while her children watched television. She then suggested hiring both of us and she divided the labour amongst us. I was responsible to wash school uniforms for her children and polish and shine their school shoes every day. I at least had time to play. My sister would stand from morning till late she was the first one to get up and the last one to sleep.

I would sometimes help her. Came month end we were not paid. We worked for six months and she did not pay us. We then asked when she was going to pay us. She quar-

relled with us told us what exactly would she pay us for. She accused us of not being appreciative as she was feeding us and keeping us safe under her roof, what more did we

We were so much bitter about her actions. We agreed between ourselves to go seek for employment elsewhere. The next morning we woke up early we did not do anything but left to seek for greener pastures. We got the same job in another homestead they only needed one person and they also preferred my sister. We separated with my sister and she wished me good luck.

I was then all by myself each homestead I told my story of seeking a job they said I was under age. I thought of going to where I left my sister but I had lost directions, I did not remember the place. It was getting darker and I was scared so I stood by the gate of another homestead because I heard had dogs bucking.

As I stood thre, a car entered the gate it was the owner of the house, he was drunk.

He shouted at me and accused me of being a thief. I tried to run away but he chased me with his car and forced me in his car and asked me to confess about what I did and who sent me to steal from him? I had to relate my story and he was so touched he took me to his house and prepared me a place to sleep in his spare bedroom.

The next morning when he was going for work he left me with a spare key to come back if I didn't get a job. He told me to feel free and make his place my home.

This man surprised me as I was not offered the job I wanted he was so supportive to me, he never made any advances to sexually abuse me but treated me like a sister as he always introduced me to his friends and girlfriend as his sister. The problem started when his girlfriend decided to move in with us. I was open to tell her the whole story not knowing she was going to take advantage and ill-treat me. When my brother was at work she used to assign me for house chores and laundry.

She would just be seated and even complain when I made mistakes. She treated me like a slave. I never complained but my brother noticed that something was bothering me and he asked me to tell his girlfriend if there was anything.

He even told her in my presence that she should take care of me because I will be shy to tell him of female issues and if there was need to buy me some pads or any staff she should take care of that.

Life was tense with his girlfriend as she always told me that I should work to be offered all that, but she would pretend as if she was taking good care of me when my brother was around.

I did not want to cause problems so I did not report her. I pretended all was well I stayed for five years with them. They got married and that was when I learnt my brother did not have a biological sister as I did not have a biological brother too.

I now stay with a boyfriend who is very abusive he broke my virginity and he is a womaniser. My dreams are just shattered. I am not educated, I do not have a job, and I am a no body on earth, my life is a shame.

I don't know if my biological mother is still alive or not. I am still hoping to meet my step sisters. Home still haunts me as the last time I went there with my brother there was no one.

The only home I am sure I still have is my brother's place, but I don't want to cause problems because my sister in-law does not like me and I know it.

It was not until we got married when he showed me his true colours. We had dated for three years and I was sure we were definitely made for each other, till our second month in marriage.

One evening my husband came back from work in a questionable state of sobriety; he showed me a number in his cell-phone and asked me if I knew it, to which I replied to the negative. He told me the number belonged to one Sibusiso whom I did not know, and he said he was my boyfriend.

When I denied knowing him, he strangled me and forced me to confess to the accusation. I stood my ground but he told me this Sibusiso guy would come to get his car repaired at the house the following day.

The day came and yes, somebody came to get his car fixed. I rushed outside to see this anonymous guy who wanted to ruin my marriage, but my husband told me stay in the house and stop running after men. As I peeped through the window, I saw no familiar face, my husband had made this accusation up, but why, I wondered.

Since I was a house-wife, he would come check the door front and when he saw men's shoes prints, I would be beaten until I was numb and be forced to have sex with him. While we have sex, he would tell me I was very wet he could feel that I had been sleeping with other men while he was away and the beating would continue till I turned green.

One day, he told me he was going to work outside town, thus, would come back on the weekend. I saw a chance of going to seek for a job; fortunately, I found it the same day at a restaurant.

Before the first weekend, he returned claiming that he could not stay away from his family and very furious about me working.

He would ensure that I don't enjoy my working life, he stopped buying food for the house, beat me up whenever I bought myself clothes yet he did not buy anything for me; grab me by the hair when I got it done saying that I was wasting money, yet I could not see what he did with his.

One of the worst days, at around 9pm, he told me we should go to the shop, when I told him it was cold, he begged me then we went. I did not notice that he had taken the kitchen knife with him until he grabbed me and threatened to stab me if I didn't tell him whom I'm cheating with.

He tried to stab me but God gave me the strength to block his hand and take the knife and throw it away from him. He then strangled me and a luckily a car come by and he embraced me making it look like we were lovebirds.

We went back to the house where he threatened to kill me in my sleep. I was too traumatised to fall asleep such that I thought of spilling boiling water on him while he was asleep but instead I prayed. In the morning, he confessed to be smoking marijuana, apologised and promised to stop since it was ruining our marriage.

I accepted his apology not knowing that the worst was yet to come.

I would literally run away from any male who talked to me regardless of what he talked about because he had spies all over the place and the consequence would be a severe beating. Whenever he failed to kill me he would try to kill himself by hanging on the rafters.


There was no more life in this relationship so I decided to end it because it seemed like he enjoyed seeing me useless. He felt like he didn't deserve me. There was an educated guy out there waiting for me, as he had not even graduated in primary school.

'MOVING FROM RHETORIC TO ACTION'

In the past 20 years we may have gone out to the world, attended this meeting or the other, but it is time that from 2019 going forward, we move around the globe to sell nothing but the kingdom and its potential and good opportunities it presents to investors.

n the next few weeks to a month, we expect the Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini and his Cabinet to present his plan of action.

We expect the genesis of that plan to be a Kingdom of Eswatini that is open for business. We expect it to clearly explain in detail how we are positioning ourselves as the destination of choice to foreign direct investors.

This should be an aggressive plan if we want to turn our economy around and put ourselves on a path to achieve our Vision 2022.

Today, it is exactly a year since Zimbabwe's president Emmerson Mnangagwa took over from President Robert Gabriel Mugabe. After gaining independence from the British, Zimbabwe went through a difficult period between the year 2000 to the time when president Mugabe finally stepped down in November last year.

Their once booming economy between the years 1980 to 2000 had been an envy of the Southern Africa region to one with a discredited currency and a collapsed economy.

This is a period our Prime Minister Mandvulo Dlamini seems to understand in life and likened it to an eagle that once in its lifetime goes through a testing stage of renewal.

It would seem in his first few days in office President Mnangagwa; despite the difficulties back home, saw him going on a world tour to convince business leaders that the once powerful economy is open for business again.

After a long struggle with white farmers who were viciously evicted from their dwellings, President Mnangagwa went around the globe, including neighbours South Africa assuring them that they are once again welcome to revive the once booming agricultural sector.

I am sure that our prime minister can see some similarities between the Kingdom of Eswatini and Zimbabwe, especially the period before 1994 and after. The Kingdom of Eswatini was once a destination of choice during the time preceding 1994. Many big companies, using our proximity to the Republic, chose to be based here than the Republic of South Africa which experienced harsh international sanctions.

The winds of change that blew across the region, in particular South Africa and Mozambique on the East, did not and still do not augur well for the kingdom. The reason is simple, when it mattered

most, the kingdom did not align itself accordingly to face the new realities.

The reality was that our once strong points of appeal diminished and the peaceful environment and stable leadership alone was no longer sufficient to attract the once powerful corporations.

With our economy in the state it finds itself in and the realization that we need to change, we believe that the prime minister's team has realised and seen the need to do things differently.

Successful

Doing things differently means now is the time to learn from the experience of countries like Singapore, Malaysia, Switzerland and Luxembourg - countries His Majesty the King described as very small but successful and running first world economies.

It was revealed during the synopsis given by experts like Phil Mnisi at Sibaya that our economic indicators look bad and we have dropped in the Ease of Doing Business index. We expect the prime minister and his team to start hitting the road once they have put together the country's plan to say to the world, The Kingdom of Eswatini remains Africa's New Promise.

In the past 20 years we may have gone out to the world, attended this meeting or the other, but it is time that from 2019 going forward, we move around the globe to sell nothing but the kingdom and its potential and good opportunities it presents to investors.

It is time we choose which global, continental and regional meetings we attend. We don't have

much resources available now, one can suggest that we must limit our involvement in meetings where the issues are not directly speaking to us as Eswatini but delegate our ambassadors to represent government.

We need from now going forward go around the globe looking for partners and further invite them into the country to look for business opportunities. That is what is going to turn our situation around. Attending a global meeting on one thing or the other will not change our situation save for being recognised as a member in good standing. We need more than just being a member in good standing; we need to look out for the interest of Eswatini. Being a member in good standing can only help us access developmental aid.

Aid
A country that wants to be amongst the best

economies looks beyond aid. In fact, no country has ever achieved sustainable economic development through developmental aid.

This government led by Prime Minister Ambrose Mandvulo Dlamini has enough literature in the form of reports and Speeches from the Throne to understand exactly where we are and what we need to do.

The challenge with the previous administration was not to follow up on the policy direction from the Throne. For instance, in 2016, His Majesty the King said the following; "the fiscal sustainability continues to challenge us, because of the highly unpredictable SACU revenues that remain one of the biggest tests of our time. For the

2016/17 fiscal year, it is projected that SACU receipts will fall further than the E6.9 billion of the year 2015/16. We, therefore, need to fasten our belts 'tighter' in order to prepare for this predicament. Our plans for the period ahead should be focused on the transformation imperatives that will accelerate growth, eradicate poverty, create job opportunities, achieve food security in light of the persistent drought and reduce inequality."

He also called upon the government to improve the regulatory framework in business by removing constraints which hinder public private sector partnerships (PPPs) and foreign direct investments.

He said this would be possible with the 30 per cent pension funds local investment. He said the repatriated funds were an opportunity to boost domestic investment to grow the economy whilst at the same time protecting the returns from these funds.

"Utilisation of these resources by the local business community requires careful planning and identification of viable large scale projects that would yield returns ranging in the billions of Emalangeni. We do recognise the projects that have been launched by the pension funds and we still encourage Emaswati to multiply these initiatives. We encourage partnerships within the business sector, incorporating the small, medium and large scale enterprises that would enhance capacity to take up and deliver multi-billion projects for the country. The sooner we join our efforts towards maximising this opportunity, the quicker we can realise a turnaround of our economy."

He went further under the mining and quarry sector to demand that this sector be developed.

He said: "we encourage government to ensure that the nation benefits from processing zones for value addition of our minerals and job creation as soon as possible, guided by an appropriate policy in this regard. This policy should be accompanied by legislation that will adequately safeguard the national interests and prevent export of our raw minerals. The Central Bank and all relevant structures must also play an active role in the safekeeping of our precious stones."

Again, this was never followed up to a level where there is visible evidence of it being implemented. If anything, we have seen a total reverse which has led us to the state of affairs we are in.

In his 2017 Speech from the Throne, again probably realising that nothing was done, he repeated these sentiment on mining: "the full potential of our mining sector remains untapped. We, therefore, need to continue maximising our mining legislation in order to create an environment that is competitive and attracts new investment. In our pursuit of earning foreign revenue with our minerals, we need to ensure that we fully harness the opportunities presented by value addition on our products." In a nutshell we are saying, whatever plan will be put forward, it must be one that demonstrates that the Kingdom of Eswatini is open for business. All potential obstacles must be removed and position the country towards attaining its Vision 2022.

Diabetes

If you inject too deep, the insulin could go into the muscle, where it's absorbed faster but might not last so long (and, it hurts more when you inject into muscle).

he way that you insert your syringe or pen needle into your skin in order to get a proper dosage of insulin is called 'your insulin injection technique'.

Your healthcare professional can help you to learn an injection technique that will make your insulin therapy as effective and successful as possible.

Injecting at the proper depth is an important part of good injection technique. Most healthcare professionals recommend that insulin be injected in the subcutaneous fat, which is the layer of fat just below the skin.

If you inject too deep, the insulin could go into the muscle, where it's absorbed faster but might not last so long (and, it hurts more when you inject into muscle).

If the injection isn't deep enough, the insulin goes into the skin, which affects the insulin's onset and duration of action.

Most people pinch up a fold of skin and insert the needle at a 90° angle to the skin fold. To pinch your skin properly, follow these steps:

 Squeeze a couple of inches of skin between your thumb and two fingers, pulling the skin and fat away from the underlying muscle. (If you use a four or five millimeter mini pen needle to inject, you don't have to pinch up the skin when injecting at a 90° angle; with this shorter needle, you don't have to worry about injecting into muscle.)

Insert the needle.

- Hold the pinch so the needle doesn't go into the muscle.
- Push the plunger (or button if you're using a pen) to inject the insulin.
- Release the grip on the skin fold.
- Remove the needle from the skin.

 Note that not everyone injects at a 90° angle. If you inject into an area of the body that has less fat, you may need to inject at less than a 45° angle, to avoid injecting into a muscle. The angle you should use to insert the syringe or pen needle into your body depends on your body type, the injection site, and the length of the needle that you use. Your healthcare professional can help you determine the right angle of injection for you.

Remove bubbles from your syringe

Bubbles in your insulin syringe won't harm you if they're injected into your body, but because they're taking up space in the syringe, they'll keep you from getting your entire insulin dose, and that can make it more difficult for you to stay in your target blood sugar range.

middle finger to make the bubbles rise. You must flick the syringe with some force to get the bubbles to move up, but don't flick too hard, or the needle may bend. Once the bubbles are at the top, or once you have examined the syringe and found no bubbles, push the extra two units of insulin back into the bottle.

 View injection demonstrations to see how to remove air bubbles from a syringe

Don't forget to push the extra insulin back into the vial - even if there are no air bubbles in the syringe - or you'll get an overdose of insulin.

If you mix clear and cloudy insulin, you can only remove bubbles from the clear insulin, which is drawn first. You can't remove bubbles after both insulins are in the syringe, because when you push insulin back into the bottle of cloudy insulin, you may be pushing clear insulin into the cloudy bottle. This would cause two problems:

 You won't get the full amount of clear insulin that you need.

 It will change the insulin in the cloudy insulin bottle that you will need to inject at a later time, (because some clear insulin has been mixed into it).

Injecting another person

The process of injecting insulin into another person isn't much different from injecting yourself.

Training and proper technique are important, and it gets easier with practice.

Family members and friends of people with diabetes who help with injections should:

• Get formal training on injecting insulin

from a diabetes nurse educator.

 Get the details on the person's insulin regimen, injection times, and angle of injection, injection site, and site rotation.

 Wear disposable medical gloves when injecting to protect yourself from insulin leakage or bleeding.

• Use safety-engineered insulin syringes to help prevent getting accidentally stuck by a needle.

One problem though is that the medication and the equipment are very expensive, not affordable and limited in the country. As the Diabetes Eswatini organisation we kindly urge the government to help and support diabetic people towards those problems they are having in living with diabetes.





plicable works of God.






I try to attain the same level of quality. He's handle on Instagram is @darealclickclack for anyone interested in reviewing he's work."

Coleman is inspired by the reality of doing great things and being credited for those great things that is a concept that has inspired him ever since he can remember.


The pictures I take project feelings, and are not just still moments. I make pictures stand out by them telling you the whole unknown story.'

PHYSIOTHERAPY AND PAIN

FIBROMYALGIA/ FIBROMYALGIA SYNDROME (FMS)



Your local physiotherapist

ibromyalgia is a common neurologic health problem that causes widespread pain and tenderness (sensitivity to touch).

The pain and tenderness tend to come and go, and move about the body. Most often, people with this chronic (long-term) illness are fatigued (very tired) and have sleep problems. The diagnosis can be made with a careful examination.

Fibromyalgia is most common in women, though it can occur in men. It most often starts in middle adulthood, but can occur in the teen years and in old age. You are at higher risk for fibromyalgia if you have a rheumatic disease (health problem that affects the joints, muscles and bones) including osteoarthritis, lupus, rheumatoid arthritis, or ankylosing spondylitis.

There are many hypotheses of how multiple factors play a role in the development of FMS. The exact cause of FMS is still being researched; however, there are several potential causes and risk factors, listed below, that are currently associated with, or increase one's risk for developing this condition.

- Diet
- Viral
- Occupation, seasonal, environmental influences
- . Adverse childhood experiences (i.e. PTSD)
- Psychological and cognitive/behavioral factors
 Other conditions: RA, systemic lupus erythematosus, or AS


Current research remains inconclusive regarding genetic or hereditary cause of FMS.

Symptoms of Fibromyalgia

Symptoms of fibromyalgia that patients most often have are:

- Tenderness to touch or pressure affecting muscles and sometimes joints or even the skin
- Severe fatigue
- Sleep problems (waking up unrefreshed)
- Problems with memory or thinking clearly Some patients also may have:
- Depression or anxiety
- Migraine or tension headaches
- Digestive problems: irritable bowel syndrome (commonly called IBS) or gastroesophageal reflux disease (often referred to as GERD)
- Irritable or overactive bladder

Temporomandibular dis-





symptoms including face or jaw pain, jaw clicking, and ringing in the ears)

How is fibromyalgia diagnosed?

A doctor will suspect fibromyalgia based on your symptoms. Doctors may require that you have tenderness to pressure or tender points at a specific number of certain spots before saying you have fibromyalgia, but they are not required to make the diagnosis.

A physical exam can be helpful to detect tenderness and to exclude other causes of muscle pain. There are no diagnostic tests (such as X-rays or blood tests) for this problem. Yet, you may need tests to rule out another health problem that can be confused with fibromyalgia.

Because widespread body pain is the main feature of fibromyalgia, health care providers will ask you to describe your pain. This may help tell the difference between fibromyalgia and other diseases with similar symptoms.

Other conditions such as hypothyroidism (underactive thyroid gland) and polymyalgia rheumatica sometimes mimic fibromyalgia. Blood tests can tell if you have either of these problems. Sometimes, fibromyalgia is confused with rheumatoid arthritis or lupus. But, again, there is a difference in the symptoms, physical findings and blood tests that will help your health care provider detect these health problems. Unlike fibromyalgia, these rheumatic diseases cause inflammation in the joints and tissues.

How is fibromyalgia treated?

There is no cure for fibromyalgia. However, symptoms can be treated with both non-drug and medication based treatments. Many times the best outcomes are achieved by using multiple types of treatments.

People with fibromyalgia should use non-drug treatments as well as any

medicines their doctors suggest.
Research shows that the most
effective treatment for fibromyalgia is physical exercise.

gia is physical exercise.

Physical exercise should be used in addition to any drug treatment. Patients benefit most from regular aerobic exercises.

Other body-based therapies, including Tai Chi and yoga, can ease fibromyalgia symptoms.

Although you may be in pain, low impact physical exercise will not be harmful.

Medications

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration recently approved three drugs for the treatment of fibromyalgia. They include two drugs that change some of the brain chemicals (serotonin and norepinephrine) that help control pain levels: duloxetine (Cymbalta) and milnacipran (Savella).

Older drugs that affect these same brain chemicals also may be used to treat fibromyalgia. These include amitriptyline (Elavil) and cyclobenzaprine (Flexeril). Other antidepressant drugs can be helpful in some patients. Side effects vary by the drug. Ask your doctor about the risks and benefits of your medicine.

The other drug approved for fibromyalgia is pregabalin (Lyrica). Pregabalin and another drug, gabapentin (Neurontin), work by blocking the over activity of nerve cells involved in pain transmission. These medicines may cause dizziness, sleepiness, swelling and weight gain.

Physiotheraphy

Living with fibromyalgia can be challenging. Your pain and other symptoms might take different forms from day-to-day. If you avoid activity because of pain, your overall physical fitness might be decreased.

Extensive research supports the use of education, aerobic exercise, and strengthening exercise to help improve fibromyalgia. But fear of pain often keeps people from beginning an exercise programme. Your physiotherapist will teach you how to interpret pain signals—and how to manage and decrease your symptoms—through a customised exercise program.

Your physiotherapist can help you improve not only your fitness, but your quality of life by designing a programme of aerobic exercise, which trains your heart and lungs as well as your muscles. Aerobic exercises include walking briskly (you can talk but you need to take deep breaths), bicycling, swimming, and using a stair-climbing or elliptical device.

If you have severe symptoms, your physiotherapist will work with you to gradually increase your overall activity level and your tolerance for exercise, starting you off with exercises that you are able to perform for short periods (eg, 10 minutes), and then gradually building up

longer exercise. Even short, 10-minute exercise sessions done two or three times per day can improve your strength and increase your endurance. If you have milder symptoms, the physiotherapist might focus on strengthening your muscles or increasing your cardiovascular fitness. The physiotherapist might recommend aquatic exercise in a pool to help reduce stiffness and pain while you exercise.

Even if you start out slowly, you are likely to have more pain as a result of increasing your activity. Your physiotherapist will prepare you by teaching you techniques that you can use at home, such as relaxation techniques and stretching exercises.

You might have other conditions in addition to fibromyalgia, such as tendinitis, arthritis, or heart disease. These conditions can make exercise more difficult for you. Your physiotherapist is uniquely trained to individualise treatment for those conditions, taking into consideration the effect that they might have on your fibromyalgia symptoms and on your exercise ability.

You may be prescribed medications that target brain chemicals that are responsible for the way your body deals with pain. Physiotherapists also take into account the effects that medications may have on your movement and exercise ability.

Improve your range of motion

Your physiotherapist may use manual therapy techniques to move your joints while you are relaxed to help improve your joint motion. These techniques are combined with exercise, stretching, and movements that you control.

Use special techniques

Research indicates that the best results are likely to come from combining a variety of treatments. Appropriate medications, exercise, and "mindbody techniques" can work together to help you manage your symptoms.

Some techniques, such as meditation and cognitive behavioral therapy, can change your responses to pain and promote relaxation. Physiotherapists also are educated and experienced in how to recognize behaviors that may interfere with recovery of function, and often refer patients to other health care professionals who can help them overcome these barriers.

Your physiotherapist might use biofeedback to help you control muscle tension and decrease pain, using a device that provides you with information about the amount of tension in your muscles. The physiotherapist places electrodes on your skin with a soft gel, and these electrodes record muscle tension while your physiotherapist explains how you can relieve that tension.

Your physio can also show you how to set a routine time for sleeping and waking to allow for good restorative sleep. They will discourage you from sleeping in the daytime, as that can throw off your sleep cycle.

Recent trends toward the paperless classroom

In 2013, a company in the United States conducted a nationwide survey of educators to provide a snapshot of the technology being used in the classroom and to gauge teachers' overall attitudes toward classroom technology. Of the educators surveyed, approximately 75 percent considered technology beneficial to multiple facets of learning. Educators stated that technology allowed information to be reinforced and expanded while accommodating various learning styles. 

hether by design, accident or a sheer chance, all married women will and have laid their tiny hands unto their husbands'cellphones.


The daring will say it loud and clear that all along she had been wanting to look into it so that she can confront her husband with conclusive evidence of his cheating ways.

- Training sessions must be not longer than five to 10 minutes.
- The key to training is your patience and positive attitude.
- Never punish. Use only positive motivation.
- At first reward every obedience. Give the reward instantly the good behaviour happens. Don't delay for even a second. A food treat such as a small dog biscuit is an ideal reinforcement so keep a small supply of small or halved dog biscuits in your pocket.

TEACH YOUR DOG 'STAY', 'HEEL'



- As the dog learns the lesson, replace food rewards with praise but give food treats intermittently to maintain his interest.
- Training is easiest in an enclosed space like your fenced backyard with minimum distractions.
- Once he gets the hang of a command, practice in different places.
- If the dog starts losing interest, stop, play a game and start again later. Training should always be fun and easy.
- Always end on a positive note. Always end with praise.

Teaching 'Stay'

'Stay' asks your dog to remain in that position (sitting or lying) until you release him. Stay should be for only a few seconds at a time in young dogs. If you intend to do advanced training with your dog, you could ask him to stay for half a minute or one minute and even while you are out of sight. But then release. Never leave him sitting for more than a minute or two.

- First, the dog must be able to sit on command.
- Now delay the reward for a second. Next time delay the reward for two seconds. If he tries to move say "No" sternly. Allow a second or two delay and then reward.
- Once your dog is successful at waiting for the treat, take a single step to one side and then back, followed by a reward. If your dog moves, you've probably asked him for too

much, too soon; go back to a very short stay.

- When he maintains the stay, you can start different tests by running in place, sitting on the floor, walking around him in circles, clapping your hands. Reward each step and introduce new tests slowly. If he stops staying, go back to an easier test.
- When you're ready to release him, issue a cheerful command, such as "Bingo" or "Free," give loads of praise, a treat and a game.

Teaching 'Heel'

On any walk, the dog should never forge ahead or drag behind. He should walk with his nose at your knee (level with your heel), matching your pace with or without a leash. Once he heels he can't stop for distractions so heeling is not for puppies or dogs that have not been exercised and are full of energy.

- Before you begin 'heel' the dog must be able to walk on a leash without pulling.
- Hold the leash in your right hand while taking up the slack with your left. Start with the dog on yourleft and tell him to 'sit'.
- Now hold a treat in your left hand, bring it to his nose and say brightly, "Spot, HEEL!" and walk briskly for about 10 paces, keeping the food just ahead of his nose. Stop and lift the treat slightly or gently pull up on the lead so the dog sits. Now give him the treat.
- Repeat, lengthening the time between walking and stopping.
- Once your dog walks to heel, you must give him regular breaks to catch up on the news smell the smells.

Having diabetes does not involve any particularly difficult dietary demands. In as much as sugar can affect the blood glucose, it does not mean the diet has to be sugar free.

hat is it? Diabetes is a condition that impairs the body's ability to process blood glucose, otherwise known as blood sugar.

There are several types of diabetes

Three major diabetes types can develop: Type 1, type 2, and gestational diabetes:

Type I diabetes: Also known as juvenile diabetes, this type occurs when the body fails to produce insulin. This condition occurs when the immune system accidentally attacks the insulin producing cells in the pancreas. People with Type 1 diabetes are insulin-dependent, which means they must take artificial insulin daily to stay alive.

Type 2 diabetes: Type 2 diabetes affects the way the body uses insulin. While the body still makes insulin, unlike in type 1, the cells in the body do not respond to it as effectively as they once did, thus the glucose builds up in the body.

Gestational diabetes: This type occurs in women during pregnancy when the body can become less sensitive to insulin. Gestational diabetes does not occur in all women and usually resolves after giving birth.

Prediabetes: Doctors refer to some people as having prediabetes or borderline diabetes when blood sugar is usually in the range of 100 to 125 milligrams per deciliter (mg/dL). Normal blood sugar levels sit between 70 and 99 mg/dL, whereas a person with diabetes will have a fasting blood sugar higher than 126 mg/dL. The prediabetes evel means that blood glucose is higher than usual but not so high as to constitute diabetes.


People with prediabetes are, however, at risk of developing type 2 diabetes, although they do not usually experience the symptoms of full diabetes.

Managing diabetes with a diet

Having diabetes does not involve any particularly difficult dietary demands. In as much as sugar can affect the blood glucose, it does not mean the diet has to be sugar free.

For Type 1 diabetes, timing of meals is important in terms of glycemic control and in relation to the effects of insulin injections. The diet is mainly about managing fluctuations in blood glu-

cose levels. For Type 2 diabetes, it is about losing weight and restricting calorie intake.

The following are some general dietary tips for a healthy lifestyle:

. Eat regularly - avoid the effects on glucose levels of skipping meals or having delayed meals because of work or long journeys (take healthy snacks with you)

 Eat vegetables and fruits and eat them in place of high-calorie foods - a variety of fresh, frozen and canned is good, but avoid high-calorie sauces and food containing added salt or sugar

 Whole grains high in fibre are recommended as a healthy source of carbohydrate

• Eat pulses, a low-fat starchy source of protein and fibre, such as beans, lentils, chickpeas and garden peas

 Reduce intake of saturated and trans fats by having poultry and fish without the skin and cooked, for example, under the grill, rather than

 Take a similar approach to cooking red meat while reducing intake and looking for the lean-

. Eat fish twice a week or more, but avoid batters and frying - go for oily fish such as salmon, mackerel, sardine, trout and herring, which are rich sources of omega-3.

 Avoid partially hydrogenated vegetable oils and limit saturated fat and trans fat - replace them with monounsaturated and polyunsaturated fats

 Dairy awareness helps reduce fat intake - select skim (fat-free) milk and low-fat (one per cent) dairy products, reduce consumption of cheese and butter and swap out creamy sauces for tomato-

 Cut back on sugar by avoiding added sugars in drinks and foods - have tea and coffee without sugar, avoid fruit that is canned in syrup and pay attention to food labels

• Cut back on salt - prepare foods at home with little or no salt and avoid foods with high sodium such as processed foods

 Cut back on portion sizes - be wary of amounts consumed when eating out

Be wary of "diabetic" foods - they are of no particular benefit and can be expensive

. Drink alcohol only in moderation - as a guide, no more than one drink a day for women and no more than two for men.



DA opens criminal case against EFF and Julius Malema over 'VBS looting'

OHANNESBURG - DA MP Kevin Mileham has opened a criminal case in connection with the 'looting' at VBS Mutual Bank against the EFF, party leader Julius Malema and his deputy, Floyd

Mileham deposed an 11-page affidavit at the Cape Town police station on Thursday, quoting various news articles about the bank. He said, "I rely upon the veracity of the newspaper reports referred to and that I am deposing this affidavit on the presumption that the reports are factually accurate."

He said in the affidavit that it was well documented how vulnerable people such as mine workers' widows and hard-pressed municipalities had money stolen from them by politicians and corrupt officials through the VBS Bank heist, through a variety of illegal schemes.

"One primary beneficiary of the illicit VBS Bank funds was allegedly Sgameka Trading Pty Ltd, a company purportedly owned and managed by Brian Shivambu, EFF deputy president Floyd Shivambu's broth-

Through WhatsApps, e-mails and

income streams, Scorpio, an investigative organisation, has formed a link between Sgameka Trading ... and VBS Bank. Between June 2017 and February 2018 it received 13 payments totalling R16,148,569 in illicit VBS funds.

Mileham said bank statements showed that as soon as Sgameka received the alleged "proceeds of crime, the money was moved mainly to accounts of the EFF and Matsobane Phaleng's Mahuna Investments". He said Phaleng was Malema's cousin.

Mileham said Scorpio had traced a total of R1.8m of VBS money which had allegedly gone toward propping up the EFF.

He said R450 000 was paid from Mahuna to a property in Sandown, whose title deed indicated that it belonged to the EFF. The house was at one stage occupied by Malema.

"I am of the belief that on a proper reading of the article and investigation report it becomes apparent that there is indeed a potentially wide range of criminal offences that were committed, including offences in terms of the Prevention of Organised Crime Act," Mileham said.

Allow cabinet members to 'amend' their answers - Jackson Mthembu

OHANNESBURG - ANC chief whip Jackson Mthembu wants parliament to come up with a new rule that will allow cabinet members to amend incorrect answers they provided to the legislature within a specific time frame.

The ANC's call comes about a week after President Cyril Ramaphosa wrote to national assembly speaker Baleka Mbete correcting an answer he gave to DA leader Mmusi Maimane about his son Andile's business dealing with controversial company Bosasa.

At the moment, we don't have such a rule. The corrections by the president were new areas that parliament needs to look at in terms of its rules," said Mthembu on Thursday.



He said the rule would also cover statements by MPs, including information shared during debates. Andile. Ten days later, Ramaphosa sent a correction to the legislature, saying there had been a donation from the company to his campaign for the ANC presidency to that amount and it was made without his knowledge.

In his initial reply in the National Assembly Ramaphosa said that the payment was in respect of a consultancy contract his son's company had signed with Bosasa.

Bathabile survives reshuffle, Mzansi not impressed

OHANNESBURG - President Cyril Ramaphosa announced his new cabinet on Thursday and the fact that Bathabile Dlamini remains a minister did not sit well with social media.

Ramaphosa announced that Siyabonga Cwele replaces Malusi Gigaba as home affairs minister.

Cwele is the former minister of telecommunications and postal services, a department which will be merged into a single unit together with the communications department.

The department will be headed by Stella Ndabeni-Abrahams. The introduction of a young female into a ministerial position was largely welcomed by the public. However, the fact that Dlamini remains in her position as minister of women in the presidency was a bitter pill to swallow for many.

In September, the Constitutional Court found that Dlamini had been 'reckless' in her handling of SA Social Security Agency grants payments while she was the social development minister.

The court urged the director of public prosecutions to decide if she would be charged with perjury for being found to have lied under oath.

Bus drives off mountain highway

NEPAL - A bus packed with people returning from a village fair drove off a mountain highway in Nepal on Thursday, killing 16 people and injuring 20 others. The bus rolled about 300 metres down a mountain slope before it slammed near a river in west Nepal, government administrator Karunakar Awasthi said. Rescuers were struggling because of darkness and remoteness of the area but managed to recover the bodies and take the injured to hospitals. Awasthi said the bus appeared to have dragged on the road before veering off, indicating there could be a brake failure. The road was wide enough for three buses to easily pass and there was not much traffic on the route, he said. AP

Two cops killed in gunmen attack

KARACHI - At least two policemen were killed when unidentified gunmen stormed the Chinese consulate in the Pakistani port city of Karachi yesterday, officials said. Up to four gunmen tried to enter the consulate but were intercepted by security guards at a checkpoint, senior local police official Javaid Alam Odho told AFP. An exchange of fire resulted "killing two of our constables and critically wounding another," he said. He added that the attackers "ran away" but did not confirm if the attack was over, saying the area had been cordoned off and security forces were conducting a clearing operation.



Russia may deploy missiles on allies' territory

MOSCOW - A senior Russian lawmaker says that Moscow could deploy missiles on the territory of its allies if the US stations such weapons in Europe. Konstantin Kosachev, Head of the foreign affairs committee in the upper house of the Russian Parliament, said on Thursday that the US intention to withdraw from the 1987 Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty could herald the way for deployment of missiles banned by the pact to Europe. He warned that if such deployment happens, Russia will target US missiles with its weapons. AP

NEW DELHI - The night before John Chau returned for the last time to India's remote North Sentinel Island, he struggled with a sense of fear that his death might be imminent." But even officials don't travel to North Sentinel, where people live as their ancestors did thousands of years ago, and where outsiders are seen with suspicion and attacked.



EW YORK - Hillary Clinton warned Europe to get a handle on immigration or it could lead to the election of a Donald Trump of its own.

The former presidential candidate told the Guardian that immigration was inflaming voters and contributed to Trump's election in the United States and Britains' vote to leave the European Union.

She called on European leaders to send a strong signal showing they are 'not going to be able to continue provide refuge and support'.

'I think Europe needs to get a handle on migration because that is what lit the flame,' Clinton said to the newspaper. She praised German leader Angela Merkel, who has been struggling with the wrath of voters in her country, who are furious over Merkel's open-door policy.



"I admire the very generous and compassionate approaches that were taken particularly by leaders like Angela Merkel, but I think it is fair to say Europe has done its part, and must send a very clear message -

'we are not going to be able to continue provide refuge and support' - because if we don't deal with the migration issue it will continue to roil the body politic,' Clinton said. The former secretary of state, who

lost to Trump in a bitter fight in the 2016 presidential election, urged leader not to neglect race issues that she said were behind her loss.

She charged Trump with exploiting racial politics in order to the win the election and continuing that policy while he is in office.

"The use of immigrants as a political device and as a symbol of government gone wrong, of attacks on one's heritage, one's identity, one's national unity has been very much exploited by the current administration here,' she said.

"There are solutions to migration that do not require clamping down on the press, on your political opponents and trying to suborn the judiciary, or seeking financial and political help from Russia to support your political parties and movements,' she added. Daily mail

ONDON - The UK and European Union negotiators have reached a Brexit deal and leaders are set to sign off on it on Sunday. But it's far from over yet. Here are the five things to know as we head into the most perilous part.

1. What's the deal?

It's the most important international agreement in Britain's post-war history. It sets out the terms of separation that allow the UK to depart the European Union on March 29 in an orderly fashion - and brings with it a 21-month grace period to give everyone time to adjust. Alongside it is a political declaration that sets out that the two sides want how the two sides want to trade in the future - but the details of a free-trade agreement could take years to work out.

2. What now?

WIFE OF ACADEMIC JAILED FOR SPYING IN UAE

ONDON - The wife of a British academic sentenced to life in prison for espionage in the United Arab Emirates said Britain's foreign secretary assured her Thursday that the government was now working to get him out of jail after months of inaction to gain his freedom.

Daniela Tejada had earlier told the BBC that Foreign Office officials bungled the case of her husband, 31year-old PhD student Matthew Hedges, who was arrested May 5 at Dubai

Airport after a research trip to the UAE. But after emerging from her meeting with Foreign Secretary Jeremy Hunt, she said authorities pledged to 'return him home to me.

"He has assured me that he and his team are doing everything in their power to get Matt free and return him home to me," she said. "This is not a fight I can win alone and I thank the Foreign Office and the British public for now standing up for one of their citizens." Tejada has become her husband's primary advocate, turning up the pressure on the government to act. She told the BBC earlier in the day that the government had failed to robustly intervene on Hedges' behalf during the early stages of his imprisonment when he was held in solitary confinement under inhumane conditions. "I was under the impression they were putting their interests with the UAE above a British citizen's rightful freedom and his welfare," Tejada said. "They were stepping on eggshells instead of taking a firm stance." AP

Trump threatens govt shutdown as migrant caravans approach

PALM BEACH - US President Donald Trump warned on Thursday there could be a government shutdown next month over security on the border with Mexico, suggesting he could hold up a funding deal if no more money is provided for a wall between the two countries.

"Could there be a shut down? There certainly could and it will be about border security, of which the wall is a part," Trump told reporters in Palm Beach, Florida.

The US Congress faces a deadline next month to fund parts of the federal government and a possible showdown over money for Trump's proposed border wall.

Having won control of the House in midterm elections, Democrats have said they will be even less motivated than before to meet Trump's wall demands.

Trump also said he had given the military the authorisation to use lethal force if necessary on the border with Mexico. "If they have to they are going to use lethal force. I've given the OK - I hope they don't have to."

Trump also warned that the United States could close the whole border with Mexico for a period of time "if we find that it gets to a level where we are going to lose control or our people are going to start getting hurt."

This would mean "Mexico will not be able to sell their cars into the United States," added Trump, who has complained about the number of cars US manufacturers produce in Mexico. Reuters

Eight dead as gunmen storm French drilling camp in Niger

IGER - Seven local employees of a French drilling firm and a government official were killed Thursday when suspected Boko Haram gunmen stormed the compound where they were sleeping in southeastern Niger.

The attack shattered months of relative calm in the Diffa region near the Lake Chad basin, a strategic area where the borders of four coun-

The victims, all Nigerien, were shot dead at a site in Toumour, a village near the border with Nigeria where they had been drilling two deep-water wells to improve conditions for displaced people at a local refugee camp.

Seven of them were employees of Foraco, a French firm which specialises in drilling for mining and water projects.

The eighth victim was an official from Niger's ministry of hydraulics.

"A group of terrorists attacked the building where a team of Foraco drillers and technicians were resting in the village of Tournour," a company statement said.

"The assailants opened fire on the sleeping personnel and killed eight people.'

Another five people were wounded, two of them seriously, it said, indicating that the injured were being transported to hospital in Diffa, capital of the region of the same name which flanks both Nigeria and Chad.

The location where they were staying had been chosen in agreement with the Nigerien army unit charged with protecting them, Foraco

The attackers also made off with two of the company's pickup trucks.

"There were about 15 employees there who under the protection of about 15 soldiers who had just set off to patrol the area at the time of the attack," said Thierry Merle, head of Foraco's Europe and Middle East division.

"We know that Boko Haram is active in the region but for now we've had no claim of responsibility, neither official nor unofficial," he told AFP. AFP

ULAWAYO Zimbabwean opposition leader Nelson Chamisa is reportedly now expected to appear before the Kgalema Motlanthe Commission probing the August 1 post-election violence on Monday.

According New Zimbabwe.com, the Movement for Democratic Change leader had previously been expected to appear before the commission this week, but he failed to show

Several MDC Alliance leaders, who included Vice President Morgan Komichi, National Chairperson Tabitha Khumalo, Secretary general Douglas Mwonzora and Organising Secretary Amos Chibaya were present at the commission proceedings on Wednesday, the report said.

Chamisa had previously refused to appear before the commission, demanding that President Emmerson Mnangagwa and his deputy Constantino Chiwenga be summoned to testify as well, a Daily News report said.

Chamisa said the commission should demonstrate the spirit of fairness by inviting the two to answer to claims that they were responsible for deploying the

ARARE - Zimbabwe's new Finance Minister Mthuli Ncube announced a five per cent cut to senior government officials' salaries on Thursday in a bid to mend the shattered economy.

Ncube's budget also set out plans for the biometric registration of civil servants to weed out "ghost" workers who appear on the payroll without actually turning up to work.

Ncube said the government would from January cut basic salaries "for all senior positions,... up to deputy ministers, ministers and the (presidency).

"The salary cuts are also extended to basic salaries of those in designated posts in state-owned enterprises, including constitutional commissions and grantaided institutions."

Telkom Kenya gets \$40 mln loan

Telkom will use the funds from the EIB, the European Union's not-for-profit long term investment arm, to improve and expand its network, the company and the bank said. The operator, which is the smallest in Kenya behind Safaricom and Bharti Airtel's Kenyan unit, has been focusing on data to try to win customers. It said last month it was in talks with two unidentified parties over partnerships to allow it to sell high speed internet capacity from two undersea data cables that are about to connect to the East African nation. Reuters

Priest killed in Cameroon separatist violence

JOHANNESBURG - A Kenyan priest is the latest victim of Cameroon's ongoing separatist violence, which has claimed the lives of at least 400 people at a conservative estimate according to Amnesty International since violence broke out in 2016. The priest was killed on Wednesday in Kembong in Francophone Cameroon's volatile English-speaking southwest region where violence has surged after separatists declared an independent state, the Daily Nation reported on Thursday.

According to reports the priest was killed while he was in church with no fighting reported.

Boko Haram kidnaps 50 loggers in Nigeria

JOHANNESBURG - Boko Haram militants have kidnapped 50 loggers in north-eastern

Nigeria close to the border with Cameroon, the Daily Nation reported yesterday. The abduction

took place at Bulakesa village, 25 kilometres from Gamboru in Borno state. Gunmen loyal to factional leader, Abubakar Shekau, carried out the abduction of the loggers, who were in a camp for people displaced by jihadist violence, last weekend according to a local militia. The news took a while to reach the media due to limited communications with residents in the area. Two of the loggers, however, succeeded in escaping and fled home warning others of the kidnapping. ANA

Minister suggests voluntary colonialism for Africa

BERLIN - Vountary colonialism: That's the solution a German ministered has offered to end migration from Africa to Europe, according to TRTWorld. The proposal calls for foreign powers to acquire land in Africa. But the AU says "it's a lazy answer to concerns about migration and "implies that Africa needs to give up sovereignty". The suggestion has also sparked a lot of criticism on social media.

Opposition leader named Ethiopia poll chief

ETHOPIA - Ethiopia's former opposition leader Birtukan Mideksa, who recently returned from exile, was on Thursday named as head of the country's election body ahead of the 2020 polls. Birtukan's appointment makes her the latest woman to be appointed to a highprofile role and the most senior opposition figure to be picked by Prime Minister Abiv Ahmed who is pushing through rapid reforms. As head of the National Electoral Board of Ethiopia, Birtukan will preside over a ballot that Abiy has promised will be free, fair and democratic. The ruling Ethiopian People's Revolutionary Democratic Front (EPRDF) coalition and its allies won every parliamentary seat in the 2015 poll. AFP





Blatter urges investigation of Infantino's meetings with Swiss prosecutor

ausanne - Former FIFA president Sepp Blatter called for an investigation into his successor Gianni Infantino, after Switzerland's Attorney General admitted meeting the current boss of world football's governing body.

The Attorney General, Michael Lauber, told journalists earlier on Wednesday that his meetings with current FIFA boss Infantino were "normal and regular, especially in complex cases".

The Football Leaks website alleges that Infantino offered favours to a senior Swiss prosecutor, Rinaldo Arnold, in a bid to foster a relationship with Lauber, possibly to obtain privileged information about the FIFA probe.

Lauber added that his office was disclosing the meetings for the sake of "transparency".

According to Football Leaks, the informal meetings occurred in the spring of 2016, a few months after Infantino took charge of FIFA and vowed to restore its credibility, which had been shaken by the corruption-plagued 17-year leadership of Blatter.

Investigation

The body that oversees Lauber's office, known as the AS-MPC, told AFP on Wednesday that while Lauber was not under investigation, it was examining the propriety of the meetings between Infantino and the attorney general.

Blatter reacted to Wednesday's news

by telling AFP: "The FIFA Ethics Committee... must do something and open an investigation into Mr Infantino.

'Where is the transparency preached by Mr Infantino during his election? He should report himself to the Ethics Committee to show that he is transparent."

Blatter added: "Infantino met Mr Lauber several times, whereas I have been questioned by him just once since a procedure against me was opened in September 2015."

Switzerland has pursued some 25 individual cases since a raid on a luxury hotel in Zurich in May 2015 led to the arrests of a number of FIFA executives and exposed the corrupt underbelly of



world football.

In addition to Blatter, the highprofile targets of Swiss investigators include FIFA's former secretary general Jerome Valcke and

Nasser Al-Khelaifi, the powerful Oatari national and media executive who is the president of French giants Paris Saint-Germain.

"So far, things have gone well, but we need a further effort, we must be ready.

"It's going to be a fundamental run of games coming up, as we must be ready in Serie A and the Champions League. Getting through that group would be really satisfying.

"The Scudetto is a dream for us and it is not a utopia. Utopias are impossible, dreams can be realised."

Verstappen still doesn't regret attacking Ocon

BU DHABI - Max Verstappen said on Thursday that he had "no regrets" about his violent confrontation with rival Esteban Ocon after the pair's crash during the Brazilian Grand Prix.

Fiery Verstappen was ordered to carry out two days of public service by the sport's ruling body after shoving Ocon several times following their crash on lap 44 in Interlagos last week, which cost the Dutchman a likely victory.

The 21-year-old told reporters at this weekend's Abu Dhabi Grand Prix that his response could have been "much worse"

Asked if he now had regrets for his actions he said: "No. Not really. I was after an apology and I got a bit of a different response."

He added: "At the time, I had lost a victory... It could have been much worse.

"What do you expect me to do? Shake his hand and (say) 'thank you very much

for being second instead of first'?"

Verstappen suggested Ocon goaded him during a conversation when they were on the scales in the drivers' weighing room after the race, in which Red Bull driver Verstappen finished second behind newly-crowned world champion Lewis Hamilton.

'You guys don't hear what is said on the scales, you just see me pushing, but if you understand the whole conversation, you will see it a bit differently," he said.

"It was something I didn't expect to hear. It doesn't matter what it was at the end of the day because it clearly pissed

Verstappen also dismissed comments from five-time F1 king Hamilton, who suggested Ocon - who was one lap down on the young gun - was right to try to

"I don't think it changes if you are fighting for a championship. It is easy to say of other people 'you should have done something different'," he said.

"I don't expect to crash with a backmarker. If you get hit like that, I honestly don't understand what I should do differently." Agence France-Presse

KANTE SECURES 5-YEAR DEAL WITH CHELSEA WORTH £290 000 A WEEK

ONDON - N'Golo Kante has committed his future to Chelsea by signing a new long-term contract.

Kante has agreed a deal which is thought to be worth up to £290,000 a week over the next five years.

Talks have been ongoing since the summer amid long-standing interest in the 27-year-old midfielder from Paris Saint-Germain.

"I'm happy to extend my time with Chelsea, it has been two beautiful years and I wish for more to come," Kante said after signing new terms.

"Since I came, I completely improved as a player, challenged myself and got some awards I never thought about. I like the city, I like the club and I am happy to be here for more time."

Chelsea beat PSG to sign Kante from newly-crowned champions Leicester for £32million in the summer of 2016.

In his first season at the club he helped bring the title to Stamford Bridge and was named FWA Footballer of the Year.

This year he was integral to the France team as they won the World Cup in Russia.



It has been a phenomenal rise for a player who was signed by Leicester for £5.6m from Caen only three-and-a-half years ago.

This season, he has adjusted quickly to the tactical demands of a new role on the right side of a midfield trio in order to accommodate new £56m signing Jorginho.

Kante is one of seven players to start each of the opening 12 Premier League games under new boss Maurizio Sarri.

They are unbeaten in the league and lie in third, four points behind lead-

ers Manchester City.

His current Chelsea contract which runs until 2021 was among those exposed this month via the Football Leak.

Federer unlikely to win another slam - Toni Nadal

ONDON - Swiss tennis great wrote. "I do not say it for his game, Roger Federer will struggle to add to his record tally of 20 Grand Slams, the uncle and former coach of long-time rival Rafael Nadal has said.

Via a column for El Pais, Toni Nadal feels the new generation of players have made a "quality leap".

"I find it hard to see Federer raising another Grand Slam trophy," he although I do say it for the toughness of the five-set tournaments.'

The 37-year-old Federer won his 20th major at this year's Australian Open, but struggled to maintain that form throughout 2018.

He was beaten by 21-year-old Alexander Zverev in the semi-finals of the year-end ATP Finals in London last week, with the young German going on to take the title by beating world No 1 Novak Djokovic in the final. Toni Nadal did however note that Federer had proved him wrong in the past. "I have to confess that I said that on other occasions and the Swiss, repeatedly, surprised me."

OBSERVER ON SATURDAY

Federer did not win a Grand Slam for four and a half years before he won the 2017 Australian Open by beating Rafael Nadal in the final.

Federer also won the 2017 Wimbledon title, before defending his Australian Open crown earlier this year.

But Toni Nadal added: "For some time I had my doubts about whether the youngsters would be able to overcome the game of Federer on grass, the one of Djokovic on fast courts and the one of Rafael on clay.

"And I had the impression that the change would be caused rather by

the decline of some than by the attack of others. The final in London has made me think about it.

"For now, for the coming year, I trust in the full physical recovery of Rafael. I feel new episodes of his rivalry with Djokovic and, in general, a more open panorama with the definitive incorporation of the new generation." Rafael Nadal is behind Federer on the Grand Slam tally list with 17, followed by Djokovic and America's Pete Sampras on 14.

But for the last five seasons, F1 drivers have copied their MotoGP counterparts by having each driver select a personal number, with Hamilton having run with the No



However, Hamilton will only run the No 1 on an unofficial basis in Yas Marina. He will not officially be crowned 2018 champion until the FIA gala prize giving award at the end of the season.

As a result the No 1 on his car is technically to mark his 2017 world championship win, as he would not be allowed to run it had he not clinched last season's title.

Sporting regulations requires the driver to race with a number he is registered to - No 44 in Hamilton's case - which as usual will be displayed on the rear of the car

The Brit has now won the world championship four times in the era of personal numbers and this is the first time he has competed in an official timed session with the world champion's number.

He secured this year's world title at the Mexican Grand Prix and is now looking to win his 11th race of the season at the season finale in

Sebastian Vettel was the last driver to have the No 1 on his car in a race as he elected to keep his world championship number for 2014 after winning the 2013 title.

Hamilton has in the past preferred to keep the No 44 on his car, and it is understood this remains the case. The Brit's main concern heading into first practice is the condition of his race engine.

Mercedes are heavily concerned with his engine after it was nursed home at the Brazilian GP and the team will use FP1 as a barometer to assess if it can compete in the race. Seeing as this is Hamilton's last fresh power unit of the season, he will face a grid penalty if they have to install a new one at any point this weekend. Daily Mail



OCCER-CAPITAL City giants Mbabane Highlanders are looking to end their newly discovered jinx of continuously losing at Somhlolo National Stadium.





SOWETO RIVALS BATTLE FOR TKO FINAL BERTH

URBAN - Soweto rivals Kaizer Chiefs and Orlando Pirates will battle for a place in the final of the Telkom Knockout when they meet at Moses Mabhida Stadium today, kick-off at 15:00.

Chiefs earned their place in the final four by overcoming Black Leopards on penalties (following a 1-1 draw) in the last 16 and defeating SuperSport United 1-0 in the quarterfinals – thanks to an amazing strike from defender Ramahlwe Mphahlele.

Triumph

The Amakhosi have won a record 13 League Cup titles (three of them in the TKO era), though their last triumph was in the 2010/11 season. Last season they got as far as the



semifinals before losing 1-0 to eventual champions Bidvest Wits.

Pirates had to work hard for their place in this phase of the TKO, edg-

ing Chippa United 1-0 at home in the last 16, before coming from a goal down to defeat AmaZulu 3-1 after extra time in the quarterfinals earlier this month – a Thembinkosi Lorch brace sandwiched a goal from Xola Mlambo in the Buccaneers' win over Usuthu.

Penalties

The Buccaneers have won the Telkom Knockout just once (2011) and last season got as far as the quarterfinals before they were eliminated on penalties (after a 2-2 draw) by Polokwane City.

Chiefs and Pirates have been regular cup combatants as part of their historic rivalry. Their last such meeting was in the last 32 of the 2016 Nedbank Cup, with the Buccaneers winning 2-0 thanks to a brace from Tendai Ndoro.

Victories

Yet the Amakhosi have won nine matches outright (plus three by penalties) compared to eight victories for their rivals in the teams' 24 cup meetings since 1985.

Across all competitions, the Glamour Boys' dominance is reflected in 33 wins compared to 23 for Pirates from 90 matches.

However, Chiefs have not claimed an outright win over Bucs in the last 10 meetings of the teams across all competitions, and Pirates are on a two-game winning streak in this rivalry, including a 2-1 triumph at the FNB Stadium (thanks to goals from Innocent Maela and Vincent Pule) from a league match in late October.

Supersport
