

# KING WANTS TO KNOW W AFRICAN MOSQUITOS ARE DEADLY

NEW YORK, USA-The determination of why the African mosquito is more deadly than that of other continents could provide headway in the elimination of malaria.

This was said by the Chairperson of the African Leaders Malaria Alliance (ALMA), His Majesty King Mswati III during a meeting of the Roll Back Malaria campaign held on the side lines of the 73rd United Nations General Assembly yesterday morning.

The King called for support in scientific research, among other needs, to help reduce the deadly effect of the African mosquito having noted that other continents were faced with this deadly challenge.

He said the continent is equally concerned that the mosquitos were developing more resistance to treatment drugs.

He told the gathering that in the last decade, the African continent has witnessed enormous gains in the fight against malaria but was concerned that these gains are fragile due to a resurgence of malaria in places that had previously reduced transmission.

"The fight against malaria is also becoming more complex due to the challenges posed by climate change and the development of drug and insecticide resistance. We remain concerned that the insecticides and the nets we are currently using areno longer as effective due to the resistance," he said. He cautioned that in the search for new strategies that include providing new types of nets and insecticides, they should ensure that these are economically affordable to all countries. The chairperson also highlighted the need for strong and resource mobilisation if the fight against malaria is to succeed. "We need to address the strengthening of regulatory systems so that registration is harmonised for

rapid entry of new products into the market.

#### Increase

We need to increase domestic financing for malaria by initiating resource mobilisation activities that complement the contributions from the Global Fund and other international organisations," he said.

He cited the example of the Kingdom of Eswatini which has created a malaria fund to tap into resources from the private sector since government cannot fight the scourge alone.

He praised the renewed glob sis to support the high burden countries but requested that this is not at the expense of the low burden coun-

"We should not be the victims of our own success. I wish to underscore that as we target elimination, we need more support from the international partners to deal with the impact that continues to be high. We also need to enhance the use of real time data to guide programming decisions and investing in health systems,"

The king said there was hope in the fight against malaria and used Eswatini as an example of one of the countries that has shown the potential to eliminate malaria by 2020, 'but we have also experienced an increase in malaria cases recently.

"That is why we are taking measures to address this undesirable 'detour' in our quest to win the malaria war. We are strengthening our malaria interventions, including enhanced surveillance, ensuring timely vector control through indoor residual spraying, strengthening prompt diagnosis and treatment, as well as engagement of the community," he said.

He called for cross-border collaboration to synchronise interventions, especially on spraying, as this was also critical since without malaria being eliminated in all neighbouring countries, the risk of malaria re-emerging would remain. He emphasised that working together at operational levels, as well as the engagement of different types of leadership at all levels, would guarantee an end to malaria. "Speaking for and on behalf of the Kingdom of Eswatini, and as the chair of the African Leaders Malaria Alliance, we confirm that we are ready to work with you all in this fight. Let us all stand together for this cause, "zero malaria starts with me", he said.

# King, leaders given seven priority areas

United Nations seeking to become more relevant to all member states, leaders were challenged to deliver on seven priorities their peo-

President of the 73rd United Nations General Assembly Maria Garces, outlined these areas as; gender equality, migration and refugees, creation of decent work opportunities, environmental protection, commitment to persons with disabilities, reforms of the UN system and the promotion of peace.

Garces was speaking at the official opening of the General Assembly on Tuesday morning, which was attended by His Majesty the King. The theme for this year's session was; 'Making the United Nations relevant to all people; Global leadership and shared responsibilities for peaceful, equitable and sustainable societies'.

"I would like to inaugurate the 73rd Session of the General Assembly with an effusive call to world leaders to meet the needs of our peoples and not to lose heart in their efforts to build a more peaceful, more secure and more human world order, where everyone can find their place with dignity. Let us, therefore, build a

United Nations that is more relevant to all," she urged. Outlining the priorities, Garces be rooted in dialogue and said achieving women's economic and productive inclusion could increase world gross domestic product by 11 per cent by 2025.

She projected that the imple-

NEW YORK - With the mentation of the new global compacts on migration and refugees would benefit around 260 million migrants and 25 million refugees who have been displaced by conflict and violence.

The creation of decent work opportunities for all, she said, was one of the most important challenges of public policy in terms of the development and sustainability of social security systems.

On environmental protection, Garces said the world did not deserve to experience tragedies such as the worst monsoon flood in recent history, which killed 400 people and displaced a million more from their homes in India or the hurricanes that killed thousands of people in 2017, making them one of the deadliest extreme climate disasters in history.

The importance of deepening the political and social commitment to persons with disabilities and the revitalisation of the United Nations were also emphasised by the

"The seventh priority will be peace and security and the role of young people in conflict prevention.

The Assembly should become the main peace-building organ, through a preventive approach.

Sustainable peace should understanding. Facilitating this dialogue will be my priority", she promised.

His Majesty was due to address the Assembly yesterday afternoon.

ical motives, in particular as cheap propaganda strategy to promote anarchy and put a damper on the national elections.



"This damaging information has nothing to do with the non-existent or defunct 'Eswatini Police Union'. The source has been traced to a foreign based or self-exiled proscribed entity; which has been perpetually criticising the country's political system through various forums," she

Vilakati, however, declined to reveal the identity of the exiled proscribed entity which she said was behind this information.

She assured the citizenry that the police service and its personnel membership remain focused and much committed and loyal to serve the country and its populace, and hence no amount of cheap propaganda would sway or derail the men and women in blue.

# ARMED COPS CALLED AS **UNIVERSITY STUDENTS RIOT**

HUNDREDS of officers from the **Operational Support Services Unit** (OSSU) were yesterday deployed at the Southern Africa Nazarene University (SANU) after students engaged in a class boycott.

The boycott was sparked by the university's refusal to allow 84 students doing a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and Midwifery (BSNM) back into class.

The university refused the students entry on the grounds that it had noted an appeal against a High Court judgement that ruled in favour of the students, with the court ordering that the institution should set aside its decision to force the students to rewrite the examination paper.

The students were forced to re-write the examination after they were accused of copying because they all passed with flying colours. Yesterday, all hell broke loose when the students boycotted classes and were soon joined by their colleagues. SANU Students Representative President Zamokuhle Mamba said the university has taken this matter way too

personal as it has made it clear that it would appeal until it sees to it that students lose. Mamba said as students, they have successfully challenged the institution against re-writing the examination paper, and the High Court made it clear that the institution did not follow the write procedure as it did not even get the students' side of the story but only assumed that they copied and then forced them to re-write the exams.

Mamba said barring students from going into class has caused other problems for students. Mamba said there is a litany of other issues affecting students as a whole. He said supplementary results were released very late, students received their allowances very late and there are still those who have not yet received their allowances. Mamba said there are students who were promised refunds by the institution but up until today they have not received anything. Meanwhile, SANU Registrar Stanley Ngcwane, when contacted about yesterday's boycott, said as an institution they are aware of the issue raised by students, especially the court case. He said it is not that the university is taking the matter too personal, adding that SANU was only exercising its right given by the court.

He said it was unfortunate that the students are working against a fixed time period while, on the other hand, court processes take their own time.

Ngcwane said he could not dwell much on the merits of the matter as it is still in

#### Sex predator loses appeal against 45-year jail term

THE Supreme Court of Eswatini yesterday dismissed an appeal against a 45-year jail sentence by a man who raped three of his nieces without a condom, transmitting sexual infections to them in the process.

The appellant, whose name has been deliberately withheld to protect the three minor children, wanted his sentence to be reduced to 30 years.

Supreme Court Judge Jacobus Annandale, who was sitting with Justices Dr Odoki and Robert Cloete, in his judgment stated that the court has the duty to protect society against the scourge of sexual onslaught committed against defenceless women and children by selfish sex predators that have no regard for fundamental rights to dignity.

"This jurisdiction is fraught with rape victims as young as three years of age. If this trend continues, the fundamental rights entrenched in the Constitution would count for nothing. The continued prevalence of the crime of rape is an indictment to this court as the highest court in the land to take a decisive action in the fight to restore dignity of women and children by imposing appropriate deterrent sentences to rape offenders," Justice Annandale said.

Justice Annandale stated that the trial court stooped into the atmosphere of the case and is best equipped to adequately assess and impose the most appropriate sentences reiterating that the main occurrence of interference in a sentence by the Supreme Court would be if the sentence is held to be shocking or startlingly disapropriate with what the appeal court itself would have imposed. The trial court, according to Judge Annandale, adequately balanced the personal circumstances of the appellant against the interests of the community and the crimes themselves and further the trial court did not strive for severity nor surrender to misplaced pity.

According to Justice Annandale, had mercy not played its adequate role, longer terms of imprisonment could have as well been imposed on the appellant.

"Notably, it was ordered that the sentences which relate to incest where the same two girls were repeatedly raped over

a period of time by their uncle, the appellant, were ordered to be served concurrently with the respective sentences of rape involving the same victims," Justice Annandale said. Although the consequences of having been raped differs from survivor to survivor, Justice Annandale stated that it leaves behind emotional scars and trauma for many years to come if not for life and far worse than the trauma that could have been imagined in respect of other forms of physical violence.

The court noted that disturbingly, the media reports now and again about the ultimate tragic aftermath of rape survivors who end up committing suicide as no amount of counselling, compassionate care or rehabilitation could ever undo the trauma of physical violation in the most derogative and humiliating manner a rapist inflicts. "Accordingly and with all the above stated considerations in mind, this court must decline to interfere with the sentences of the appellant before us, in the result I would order the appeal against sentence to be dismissed," Justice Annandale pronounced, with both Justices Dr Odoki and Cloete agreeing with him.



HAVING won the elections, newly elected Shiselweni I Member of Parliament (MP) Christian Ntshangase is planning a party for his constituency.

He wants to slaughter at least five beasts for his constituency, at an event to take place at the inkhundla next month.

Ntshangase, younger brother to former Minister of Education Wilson and Correctional Services Commissioner General Mzuthini, said it was important to show appreciation to the people who showed trust and confidence in him.

He said he was planning to stage the

party dubbed 'thanksgiving' next month. He said preparations were already pro-

gressing and was still working on a suitable date for the event.

The MP said since the constituency consists of five chiefdoms, five beasts would then be slaughtered.

"We have tentative dates so far for the thanksgiving, there is October 12 and October 19, and we will decide on which one is suitable," said Ntshangase.

Ntshangase said all members of the Inkhundla team need to be involved in the thanksgiving as it was not just him who should be in the spotlight after winning the elections.

"I want in particular the indvuna yenkhundla to be part of this big celebration as he is a stakeholder. I am still to consult how best this event can be held but I am planning to make it memorable in the history of the constituency," said Ntshangase, a successful businessman directing Mhuma Investments.

Ntshangase said it would not only be about feasting or enjoying the meals which would be in abundance, but the event would be where they would be seeking God's guidance on how to carry out their work as inkhundla team and the constituency's servants.

Ntshangase will be the second one in the family to become a legislature as his elder brother Wilson served as MP in the 9th parliament (2008/2013) and he further landed a cabinet post as he was appointed Minister of Education.

# Ntfonjeni people protest against elections

ABOUT 180 residents of Ntfonjeni marched to the area's constituency to protest against the recently concluded national elections.

The protesters were accusing the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) of allowing buses of voters into the Mshingishingini polling station at Ekujabulweni Community Primary School to vote illegally.

These buses are said to have appeared after voting at the station wgich was officially closed at 1900 hours on Friday.

The protesters further alleged that the polling station's gates where open until 2300 hours, allowing the illegal voters ample time to vote.

The two-kilometre march started at the main road at Ntfonjeni to the constituency where the protestors were met by Hhohho Regional Secretary Sibusiso Dlamini.

Speaking to this publication at the march, the participating residents said they had a problem with the way EBC handled voting at Ntfonjeni.

"Our problem is that EBC failed to close the primary school polling station at 1900 hours, instead it was closed at 2300 hours after buses offloaded illegal voters. Another query we have is that Ntfonjeni had too many voters for the area, when we heard how many voters participated, we were shocked because that area does not have more than 5 000 voters. Today we are here at the Inkhundla where we will select about 20

individuals to speak on our behalf inside the constituency," the marching residents said.

The selected residents met with Hhohho Regional Secretary Sibusiso Dlamini and members of the Royal Eswatini Police (REP) Service.

In the meeting, the RS asked the protesters if they had followed the right procedures by first speaking to their chiefs to protest.

"The correct protocol states that all of you should have first asked your chiefs to come and speak on your behalf here at the inkhundla. I understand you have not followed the correct protocol in this situation. If you have a problem with the elections then you use the correct channels and go to EBC. The EBC will then follow up on your issues. Today I will not address your concerns because I do not speak for the EBC. The only way I could have helped is if you first approached your chiefs who would have then communicated your concerns to the relevant structures. I hope that I have made my point clear," he said.

After the meeting, some of the protesters said they would be going to the EBC headquarters.

Meanwhile, EBC

Communications Officer Mbongiseni Bhembe said the EBC practised an open door policy and if the aggrieved individuals had concrete evidence of their allegations they are free to

approach their office (EBC).
On that note, other Ntfonjeni residents, police and those that lost in the elections disputed the story that the Mshingishini polling station was closed later than 1900 hours on Friday.

### Tommy Kirk, Gomora case postponed

THE matter between businessmen Tommy Kirk and Mndeni Gomora Simelane which is pending at the High Court could not kick off yesterday.

The matter has since been postponed to a date yet to be allocated by the court possibly in the next session.

The next session of the High Court

The next session of the High Court resumes in January, 2019, since this is the last session of the 2018 court calendar.

Kirk is represented by Manzini based Lawyer Macilongo Ndlovu while Simelane is represented by Lawyer Bongani Bhanyaza Mdluli.

The matter involving Kirk and Simelane revolves around Kirk's property in Matsapha where Simelane is renting a bar at Alcapone and he is owing rentals amounting to more than E60 000. Kirk, in his capacity as trustee of the Quadro Trust, in 2016 won an interim order to



attach property belonging to Simelane from the premises the trust leased to him

It had been stated that Simelane owed rentals for four months at that time.

Kirk, in an affidavit, said the trust entered into an agreement with Simelane to lease a bar at Lot 217 in Matsapha and they agreed that he would pay E15 000 monthly as rent.

He said the agreement was entered into in October, 2015.

He claimed that he represented Quadro Trust while Simelane represented himself

"It was terms of the agreement that rent would be charged at E15 000 per month in advance and on the first day of each month," Kirk said.

He alleged that they agreed that an additional E15 000 would be paid along with the first rental and 14 per cent value added tax (VAT) which totalled to E34 000.

He said Simelane paid the E34 000 and was handed the premises.

Kirk claimed that Simelane took occupation of the premises and operated the business, but failed to pay rentals for November and December, 2015.

He also alleged that Simelane failed to pay rentals for January and February, 2016, hence the lease was cancelled.

He applied that the premises should be broken into and new locks be installed while the property inside remained attached pending payment of the E60 000 arrear rentals. High Court Judge Ticheme Dlamini had issued an interim order directing a deputy sheriff to attach the property inside the premises, make an inventory.

THE death of veteran Manzinibased Lawyer Leo Mduduzi Gama is not only a loss to his family, relatives and friends, but also his clients who he was representing in criminal matters. This means that they now have to instruct new counsel to represent them both at the High Court and magistrate's courts.

Some of the clients who were represented by Gama have been mentioning before court that their lawyer Gama was not well and their matters had to be postponed to later dates with the hope that he would recov-

er.

Throughout his illustrious career, Gama has been handling a host of high profile cases, including the recent mysterious case of businessman, Almor Oliveria, who is believed to have been murdered. Gama was representing one of the suspects, Dao Thanta Hue, in a pending case.

He also represented police officer

Lucky 'Obama' Matsenjwa in the much publicised fingerprints case.

Gama was one of the senior attorneys in the country, having been admitted into the bar almost 20 years ago.

He ran an established law firm at the Liqhaga Building in Manzini and has been a fully-fledged member of the LLS all his working life. Gama who was an experienced legal eagle polished by years of courtroom litigation, succumbed to death at his home in Manzini around 2130 hours surrounded by close friends and family last Monday and was laid to rest on Sunday morning at a funeral that was preceded by a Memorial service at the Manzini Catholic Cathedral Church.

# FORMER MINISTERS' EXPERIENCE ON LAST 5 YEARS

FORMER ministers who were at the helm of different ministries have shared their experiences in the ministries they led in the past term.

THE introduction of matric in the country is tantamount to new colonialism.

Former Minister for Education and Training Dr. Phineas Magagula said this syllabus was a new form of colonialism to the Kingdom of Eswatini.

He said this syllabus was designed by people of another country (South Africa) to be taught in that country.

It was unfortunate that some Emaswati would see an opportunity of importing a syllabus from another country to Eswatini yet this country had its own education syllabus, the Eswatini General Certificate of Education (EGCSE).

"If you take a certain education system from another country and impose it on the people of your own country, you are doing a disservice to your own system. You are actually passing a vote of no confidence on your very own system, in favour of the other one. This is new colonialism and we should not allow that,"

The former ministers had different experiences as they took charge of respective ministries. Some managed to finish the whole term in the ministries they were appointed into, while others could not.

Former Ministers like Phiwayinkhosi Mabuza (Housing and Urban Development), Moses Vilakati (Agriculture), and Dr. Phineas Magagula (Education and Training) managed to finish their tenure at the same ministries.

Former ministers like Magobetane Mamba and Gideon Dlamini did almost 'half-time'.

#### Matric is the new colonialism

Magagula said.

The former minister pointed out that he was aware why Emaswati wanted to do matric.

He said it could be because they wanted to access the many universities and other tertiary institutions in that country. He was also aware that the problem could be that in this country, the tertiary institutions did not absorb all Emaswati that were eligible for tertiary education.

However, Magagula said the best way of accessing education through the matric syllabus was for Emaswati to obtain a study permit and go to South Africa to do their matric. It was not good for the system to be imported into the country.

The matric saga was one of the contentious issues in the ministry of education and training, particularly after it was announced that South Africa

wanted to scrap the syllabus in this country. It was initially stated that the syllabus would be scrapped this year, but for some reason, this could not happen and it was finally decided that it would be scrapped next year. If the syllabus is finally scrapped in the country, many children doing matric in the country would be negatively affected.

Many of these pupils liked this syllabus because it enabled them to have easy access to South African tertiary institutions.

Some parents of these children complained about the study permits, stating that it was difficult to obtain them. The best thing was to bring the syllabus to the shores of the coun-

With the new Parliament coming in this year, it remains to be seen how this matter will be handled.

#### 'FPE fund must increase by 4.7%'

FORMER Minister for Education and Training Dr. Phineas Magagula is of the view that the fund allocated for free primary education (FPE) should increase by 4.7 per cent.

Magagula was interviewed yesterday by this publication about his experience at the helm of the ministry of education and training for his five-year tenure.

The former Lomahasha MP stated that education needs to get adequate funding so that Emaswati would get quality education.

He said FPE had been in existence for almost 10 years yet funding for it was still not being increased. That, according to the minister, was not being realistic because there was inflation happening in all these years. The former minister said during his tenure as education minister, he and his team wrote three different reports detailing that there was an urgent need for the FPE funding to be increased.

He said without adequate funding, the education system would not be able to give Emaswati the quality education they need.

Magagula said he understood that the resources would never be enough but they should not be meagre as that would compromise the quality of education.

On the issue of scholarship recovery, Magagula commended the

ministry of labour and social security for having initiated such an exercise. He was of the view that the money recovered must be invested so that more could be generated out of the recovered funds. The profits would be used to cater for even more Emaswati that were eligible for tertiary education. Magagula said he worked very well with his officials in the ministry of education and training. They were very helpful to him as they assited him in setting up targets they aimed to meet as the education ministry.





# MAN FINED E5 000 FOR STABBING BABY MAMA

AS cases of domestic violence continue to rise, Senior Magistrate Nonhlanhla Dlamini says she will not show any mercy on perpetrators.

She has fined Bonginkosi Shiba (25) of Mantabeni area E5 000 for stabbing the mother of his child.

Handing down the sentence, Dlamini said she would not be lenient to any domestic violence offender.

Shiba was facing a charge of assault with intent to cause grievous bodily harm (GBH).

The accused whilst at Maphalaleni area in the Hhohho region is said to have unlawfully assaulted Sibahle Nsusha, the mother of his baby with fists several times on the face. He further stabbed her with a bottle several times on the head and chest.

He appeared before magistrate Dlamini for sentencing.

Charged

The accused person had been found guilty as charged prior to sentencing.

This was after the crown had submitted overwhelming evidence before the court to prove that indeed the accused had committed the said offence.

A doctor's report stated that the com-

plainant was badly injured during the attack by her assailant.

Nsusha had also delivered her testimony before court, relating how the accused person went about when inflicting her with unbearable pain.

After the court had considered the seriousness of the matter, and the nature of the injuries sustained, the magistrate told the accused that he would not be let off the hook.

Dlamini also noted a rapid rise in cases of this nature whilst also stating that it is a cause of concern.

The accused person was then sentenced to three years imprisonment with an alternative to pay a fine of E5 000.

### Olof Palme International trains TUCOSWA, ITUC

Mhlanga said what they are also expecting to be addressed during the training are issues pertaining on how to report matters to ILO. He said it must be noted that it is not only had things that are reported to ILO, but also good things.

Mhlanga said they are blessed as TUCOSWA as the event is graced by the International Trade Union Confederation (ITCU) which is the global voice of the world's working people.

The ITUC's primary mission is the promotion and defence of workers' rights and interests, through international cooperation between trade unions, global campaigning and advocacy within the major global institutions. Its main areas of activity include trade union and human rights, economy, society and the workplace, equality, non-discrimination and international sol-

The visit by ITCU to attend the conference comes at a time when the confederation is fresh from blasting government forces which is the Royal Eswatini Police for attacking workers during a peaceful demonstration calling for pay rises over the past week.

#### Ex-Minister Shongwe's corruption case postponed

FORMER Justice and Constitutional Affairs Minister Sibusiso Shongwe's corruption trial could not kick off on Tuesday morning as it had been set for September 25 before Judge Mbutfo mamba.

The matter was postponed to next Wednesday where the crown is expected to read the charges to the former minister before parading witnesses.

On Tuesday, South African Advocate Gareth Lepan who is instructed by crown counsel Thabo Dlamini, was present in court and Shongwe's lawyer Lucky Howe of Howe, Masuku, Nsibande law firm briefly appeared in court before the matter was postponed to next Wednesday.

The last time the matter was before Judge Mamba, it was set for trial this past Tuesday.

Initially, the trial had been set for March 5 and was allocated 10 days.

Shongwe's case is amongst those that are expected to be finalised before the close of the last session of the High

The former minister was in 2014 arrested in connection to E2 million that was found in his law firm's trust account, which he allegedly failed to disclose its source when requested to do so by ACC Investigators.

His law firm practices under the style Sibusiso B Shongwe and Associates and is based in Mbabane.

Already there has been a pre-trial conference for the legislator and the crown is now expected to parade its witness-

#### LIST OF SHONGWE'S **CHARGES**

Shongwe is facing a total of 10 charges and amongst these is defeating the ends of justice, according to the indictment filed at the High Court.

He is facing seven charges of contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006, one charge of defeating the ends of Justice, another for theft and the other for fraud.



charged with contravening the Prevention of Corruption Act of 2006 in that on December 17, 2014 while at Mbabane, being a politician, he allegedly unlawfully accept or agreed to accept an advantage from another person who has links with Impunzi Wholesalers to the form of money amounting to E2million for his benefit and that of Impunzi in abuse of his position as a politician to an unauthorised inducement to bribe judicial officers.

Alternatively he is charged for abusing his position and authority and violating legal

duties to bribe and influence.

 Count two Shongwe and his law firm Sibusiso Shongwe and Associates are charged under the same Act in that they jointly acted in furtherance of a common purpose by controlling funds amounting to E2miilon and upon being requested to give information on same failed to do so as requested by the ACC Commissioner.

• Count three while being a public officer he allegedly did control, pecuniary resources amounting to E2 million which was disproportionate to his present and past emoluments and failed to give explanation to ACC Commissioner.

#### Quantum driver loads 28 passengers along deadly road

A public transport driver is said to have diced with the lives of school children as he loaded 28 of them in a motor vehicle which has a carrying capacity of only 14 passengers.

As that was not enough, the driver further drove the overloaded public vehicle through the pothole riddled Lukhula-Big Bend road which has literally become a death trap to its users.

This transpired when the driver, Wandile Masuku (33) appeared before Magistrate transport vehicle which was Dumisa Mazibuko at the Big overloaded with seven passen-Bend Circuit Court.

The accused was charged with contravening section 27 of the Road Traffic Act 5 of 2007.

According to the charge sheet, the accused wrongfully and unlawfully overloaded the vehicle by carrying 28 passengers, instead of 14 passengers as per the certificate of fitness of the

This practically means the driver was carrying passengers who could be carried by two vehicles of the same class or

When the charge was read to

him, the accused person pleaded guilty to the charge while conducting his own defence.

He also told the court that he was actually transporting pupils to school in Big Bend.

The accused further asked the court to be lenient when passing sentence, claiming to be a first time offender.

He was accordingly found guilty by the court and was sentenced to six months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 as fine. Meanwhile in the same court, Kwanele Gina also faced a similar charge. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully driven a public gers. The vehicle, a quantum, was said to have been carrying 22 passengers instead of 14 passengers as per its fitness certificate.

He was nabbed along Lavumisa-Big Bend road. The accused pleaded guilty to the charge. His plea was also accepted by the Crown without leading evidence to prove commission of the offence.

He was also found guilty by the court and was sentenced to six months in a correctional facility with an option to pay E2 000 fine.



# **Application for Extension of Time**Filing of Income Tax Returns

In terms of Section 33(1) of the Income Tax Order of 1975, as Amended, the Commissioner General of the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA), hereby advises all taxpayers who intend to apply for extension of time for the submission of returns as follows;

i. Applications for extension of time are now open for consideration by the SRA.

ii. In taking into account that the submission dates have been staggered, only compelling cases will be considered.

#### **Application Process**

Applicants are expected to do the following:

 i. Complete the extension of time form in full; this is obtainable from SRA Website under forms.

ii. Attach the necessary supporting documents as stated in the application form and

iii. submit such forms to the SRA on time.

#### N.B

 Taxpayers are hereby informed that the extension of time shall not exceed sixty (60) days. For taxpayers whose financial year-end is June 30, the extended period shall not exceed 31 December 2018.

 Taxpayers who have been authorised by the Commissioner General to use a different financial year end may receive an extension for a period of up to sixty (60) days after their deadline for submission of their Income Tax Returns.

#### The following requirements must be fulfilled by the taxpayer when applying for extension of time

i. Application must be made and signed by the taxpayer's public officer and not by accountants or auditors of the taxpayer.

ii. All applications must be submitted 30 days before the end of each filing period as notified by the Commissioner General as follows;

 those with 31 October deadline; application should be submitted on or before 1 October 2018

 those with 30 November deadline; application should be submitted on or before 1 November 2018

 those with 31 December deadline; application should be submitted on or before 1 December 2018.

iii. Convincing reasons causing the delay in submitting the actual tax return are evidently advanced to the Commissioner General.

iv. The taxpayer must be compliant in all tax types for a period of 3 years successively.

v. Interim financial statements must be attached.

vi. The taxable income declared in the interim financials should have been increased by at least 10% from preceding year's taxable income. vii. In the case of a loss, the taxable income declared in the interim financials should at least be 5% of the previous year's turnover.

### Revision of Estimated Assessments to the Actual Return Assessment

Taxpayers are hereby reminded that the interim returns and financials are not final but are in anticipation of actual filing on or before the expiration of the granted extension of time period.

For the final actual return to be considered for revision, the following conditions should be met:

i. Income so declared in the Interim Return of Income should not have been less than 90% of the actual taxable income submitted in the final

return. However, where the estimated income is less than 90% sufficient reasons must be given for such shortfall.

ii. Tax due resulting from the assessment of the interim tax returns should be paid in full notwithstanding the fact that the actual tax due is less than the estimate.

Further Note the following:

· No applications will be processed after this deadline has elapsed.

 Failure to adhere to the above guidelines shall result in penalties being imposed in accordance with section 40 of the order.

 The timeous submission of an application for extension of time should not be construed to suggest extension has been granted. Written response granting/declining extension will be issued by the SRA to applicants.

# TSC BOSS HAILS SOMNJALOSE HIGH

CHAIRMAN of the Teaching Service Commission (TSC) Simanga Mamba has applauded Somnjalose High School on their improved academic performance.

"I used to come across pupils strolling at Ezulwini at around 11 am when they were supposed to be in the middle of lessons," Mamba remarked.

He was speaking during the school's speech and prize giving day on Monday. He said on various instances, he came across pupils fully clad in school uniform wondering around the area.

He said those are signs of a school with no direction and bound to fall. Mamba highlighted that the TSC struggled when a new head teacher was needed for the school because of its known bad performance.

"For the past three years, the improvement is noticeable and much appreciated," he said.

He praised parents for working hand-in-hand with the newly appointed head teacher in improving the school. Mamba highlighted that education is the key to success and Eswatini shows that by providing all educational materials required

by the pupils.

He mentioned that the government did the unthinkable and provided free education at primary level aimed at reducing illiteracy in the country. He said parents have a huge role to play in pupils' lives in order for them to be educated individuals.

"Parents must not abandon the responsibility of empowering and guiding pupils to the teachers but should always keep tabs of their children's lives," Mamba urged.

He said when pupils are guided by wise and strong principles; they tend to focus on the important things in life.

Mamba said it should be every parent's responsibility to keep tabs on his or her child. He said parents are the perpetrators of the bad performance of children.

"Parents' ignorance can destroy a child's future. If your child comes home as late as 7pm whereas school knocks off at 4 pm, let that worry you as a parent. Do not just ignore it," he said.

He said if parents support the school in nurturing pupils, that school is bound to succeed. He said school dropouts and teenage pregnancies would be limited because parents would have the same mind-set as a teacher that is eager to see pupils succeed.

"Plant the seed of the importance of education to your pupils and have a stronger belief in the essence of education," he said.

Furthermore, Mamba encouraged teachers to attend classes without fail and prepare for lessons in time. He said it should be every teacher's determination to never let any child fail because of their laziness.

"Let there be no child that has his or her future destroyed because of the lack of performance and laziness. A teacher's role in life is to change lives and a teacher's failure is evident in young people that are in prisons," he said.

ON the other hand, Chairman of the TSC, Simanga Mamba took a dedicated teacher of Somnjalose High School by surprise.

He gave the teacher a brand new cellphone. Mamba said he ordered the phone from China and the teacher would have it within a two-week period. The chairman, however, opted against revealing the brand of the phone. He said the phone would help her access the internet easily and research on important subjects.

The dedicated teacher Delisile Mhlanga was rather surprised by the recognition, saying she thought she was just doing her job.

She said even though teaching is not a highly paying job, she is passionate about it.

"It is about the love and passion I have for teaching. Working extra hours and holidays is not something I consider as hard work," she said

# Somnjalose to be amongst top 50

SOMNJALOSE High Head teacher Macandza Mamba has vowed to take the school to the top 50 in two years.

He said with the dedication and passion shown by the teachers, the school would be amongst the top schools in a two-year period. He praised parents for their support in improving the pupils' education.

# JA Eswatini National Expo: An Exciting display of creativity and innovation among in school youth

The 2018 JA program was successfully implemented in 40 schools this financial year managing to impact the lives of about 4000 learners. About 63% of the schools that implemented in the program are based in the rural areas. This meant that the most vulnerable population OF Eswatini to issues such as poverty, were able to be capacitated with the necessary skills to attain their economic growth.

The schools submitted their business plans as well as their end of year reports which were then judged by a panel of judges identified in the business community who were then able to produce the 10 best performing schools. The theme that the students were working towards this year was dubbed "integrating Information Technology into Entrepreneurship".

This theme encouraged young people to innovatively come up with business ideas that had the element of information

technology (IT) and use IT for the marketing of the identified products.

This year, the young people displayed a high level of understanding of the theme that they were working with. The businesses that made it to the top 10 are viable business that can be sustained as the organization continues to work collaboratively with the young people. The winner at the National Expo competition will represent Eswatini at the Africa Company of the year competition scheduled for the 5th of December 2018 in Ghana, Accra. Eswatini has successfully claimed the Africa Company of the Year Competition for 4 years in the 7 years in which the competition has existed.

### **REVIEW OF THE PROGRAM FROM** PERSPECTIVE OF THE LEARNERS

JA Eswatini consistently drives to attach learners according to the relevancy of their intended career path. While this may prove to be a challenge as through the influence from television, learner tend to envision careers that are not even available in the Kingdom.

This however does not deter the organisation from affording young people an opportunity to explore the world of work. An analysis was conducted to ascertain if students were attached according to their career options and the graph below discusses the data as communicated by the students.

202 students which accounts for 57% of the learners attached that they were indicated successfully attached according ton their career interests. 32 students which is 9% of the learners attached indicated that they were not attached according to their career interest.

120 (33%) students however, explained that some departments that they visited were relevant to their career interest which is where they most enjoyed themselves.

57% of the students were attached in companies with relevant departments that match their career choices and got to work in those departments that match their career choices.



# MULTISECTORAL RESPONSE (MR) BY SAMKELO MAHLALELA Information Centre Assistant Manager The National HIV and AIDS Information and Training Centre

LAST week I received an invitation from the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) to a 3 day-workshop that is part of finalising the development of National Guidelines for the Multisector Response to Gender Based Violence—that is on-going as you read.

The guidelines aim to strengthen the capacity of professionals from key essential service sectors (health, police, justice, and social sector) for an enhanced effective multisectoral response to violence against women and girls (VAWG). Ordinarily, I was excited at the opportunity to learn and obtain writing material for the readers of this column.

It goes therefore, that today you would have been reading about violence against women and girls and its effect on HIV prevention efforts. But lo and behold, as we went through the first day activities and the participants were discussing service providers attitudes towards survivors of gender-based violence, the subject of Lesbians, Gays, Bisexuals, Transgender and Intersex (LGBTIs) popped up. The ensuing deliberations changed my piece for this week- I was flabbergasted by much of the challenges facing this community of people and the potential negative impact that not addressing their issues has on the last mile to ending AIDS in the country.

#### Situation of LGBTIs in Eswatini

Consensual same sex among male adults (sodomy) is prohibited as a common law offence, punishable by a minimum of two years imprisonment or a minimum fine of five thousand Emalangeni (E5 000). So far, there has been no deliberate effort to decriminalise same sex relations in Eswatini and no one has ever been prosecuted for sexual orientation offences to date. However, LGBTI community members face regular discrimination based on sexual orientation, which often results in obstacles in accessing public services, including but not limited to health services.

Melusi Simelane, the Communications Manager for The Rock of Hope, the

country's most prominent LGBTI rights advocates, in the run up to the Pride March held in Mbabane on the 30th June this year, said "We have the daily persecution in terms of verbal attacks and even systematic exclusions from basic human rights. Hospitals continue to discriminate based on sexual orientation. People are fired from their jobs based on sexual orientation and gender identity. All these can easily go unpunished because the government insists that we do not exist"

Describing how LGBTIs are treated by the rest of society, he said it was a very trying environment that is easier for the brave. He questioned however, the need to be brave to fit in any society, saying that societies should be welcoming of all persons.

Speaking at the Pride March that many had said would not see the light of day, US Ambassador Lisa Peterson noted that allowing the parade wasa sign that justice was served in Eswatini. She said if people in communities live with the notion of being shunned by their families, church or being belittled at school, lose their jobs or being ridiculed in clinics, there is injustice and people need to make sure that justice is served.

The march itself, was aimed at offering LGBTI people an opportunity to display pride in who they are, to break free from persecution and harassment. This emanates from that many members of the LGBTI community are affected by mental health issues because they lack psychosocial support and basic love and compassion from their family and friends.

#### The LGBTI community and HIV vulnerabilities

Given the criminalisation of samesex acts, there is limited data on the experiences of the members of the LGBTI community's engagement with HIV prevention and treatment services, making it difficult to accurately gauge the role of these populations in larger HIV transmission dynamics, as well as biological, behavioural and structural risk factors that contribute to their heightened vulnerabilities. The Swaziland Behavioural Surveillance Survey: HIV among High Risk Groups (2013) had a total 324 men who were successfully recruited and consented to participate in the study - a majority (64 per cent) of which were 21 years of age or older;



with approximately one-third (39,9 per cent) reporting their sexual orientation as bisexual and 57.0 per cent reporting it as gay or homosexual. The SBSS provides the following key information:

● HIV prevalence among man who have sex with men (MSM) was 12.6 per cent;

 Only 33.3 per cent of the MSM living with HIV reported receiving treatment

• 25.5 per cent of MSM reported having both male and female partners in the past year of the survey;

● 18,3 per cent of MSM knew of the heightened risk of contracting HIV from receptive anal sex;

 57.8 per cent of MSM reported it was somewhat or very difficult to insist on condom use for male sexual partners who provide regular economic support;

 ⊕ 26.8 per cent of MSM reported using condom-compatible lubricants;

MSM reported strained interactions with law enforcement, including being refused police protection, with 36.2 per cent reporting having been tortured due to their sexual orientation;

 Almost two-thirds (61.8 per cent) of MSM felt afraid to seek healthcare due to their sexual orientation or practices

The inference that can be drawn from the available information is that there is heightened risk ascribed to MSM that may have a direct link to the general population.

The greatest danger is that posed by those men that swing back and forth (revolving-door behaviour) that are trying hard to conform to societal demands and pressures by dayand unleash their true selves behind closed doors. Living a double life has definite implications on their health and those of their partners.

For many that access social support networks, these are often centred at bars and night clubs yet substance use is linked with elevated sexual risk practices and violence – as alcohol use may lead to loss of inhibition.

#### HIV Risk reduction strategies for LGBTI sexual health

LGBTI people have a role to play in ending AIDS. The first step is to TALK to a healthcare worker.

● Talking – Talk to a healthcare worker freely about what you want from life, love, a sexual partner. Consider talking to partner(s) about their sexual history, about what they want and like during sex, and how to make it safer. There are benefits of good communication which often lead to better sex. When necessary, open talk between a health healthcare worker and a client is always a good thing – if each person feels safe and comfortable, an honest conversation leads to more focused information.

● Testing — Getting tested - for HIV, for STIs (and for cancers like prostate and cervical cancer) — will help you plan their sexual and reproductive health and get the support needed. It can be scary to test but knowing is often better than not knowing. If you test with your regular partner, if you have one, they can be included in the discussions with healthcare providers about the way forward

Technique – Learn about good sex and sex that is safe, using condoms or femidoms for penetration and the right amount of water-based lubricants is excellent. Use condoms for sex toys too or clean them carefully before sharing. In oral sex, avoid getting sexual fluids in their mouth. Using a barrier like a condom or dental dams offers the most protection.

■ Treatment – Being on ART, adhering well and having a viral load that is undetectable, makes sexual activity much safer. If one partner is HIV negative there is the daily oral pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) as well as the common post exposure prophylaxis (PEP) taken within 72 hours after an unprotected sexual encounter to greatly reduce the chances of HIV infection.

Type of relationship—If you are in a closed relationship (just you and partner) with a high level of trust, then you can negotiate and agree on sex without a condom when both partners are negative. Remember to still test regularly. For sero-discordant couples, it is important to talk to a healthcare worker about safe sex. The need to adhere to ART medication not only to live healthier lives but also to protect persons you are sharing your life with, cannot be over-emphasised.

Tools – These are things used in sex to make it more interesting and/or safer. Condoms, femidoms, waterbased lubricants, dental dams, finger cots, dildos, vibrators, all help balance pleasure and risk management.

Theory – Know your facts about HIV and STI transmission; Facts about sexual health, sexual pleasure and how one's body works; Facts about alcohol and drugs – when one is drunk or high, safe sex decisions can be affected; Facts about medicines and ART; Facts about mental health – if you are depressed or have lost self-worth, you may be less inclined to protect yourself and be safe.

HIV and AIDS have previously challenged us to re-visit certain stereotypes that contributed to an increased HIV positive population. In the face of this ticking time bomb, perhaps it is time we look at how stigma and discrimination on sexual orientation will effectively impact the future of Eswatini.

The 'revolving door' behaviour of many men in particular, remains a great challenge but in the meantime, we can all play our part in easing the stigma by judging ever so little and creating the enabling environment we desire to get us to End AIDS by 2022.

#### GREATNESS OF BURDEN

THIRDLY, in this kind of praying, there must be a focus on the greatness of burden.

Notice again what happened to Nehemiah after he learned about the broken walls and the burnedup gates and the affliction of the people.

We read in verse four: "And it came to pass, when I heard these words, that I sat down and wept, and mourned certain days, and fasted, and prayed before the God of heaven..."

I believe God was sharing with Nehemiah His tears. Nehemiah wept as his brothers told him about the deplorable condition of this great city that was once the jewel of the world, the most powerful government in the world and the most powerful and wealthy kingdom in the world.

Now it was in shambles, and the people who had once been perhaps the most honoured and feared in the earth because of their military and economic power, now were in disgrace. People laughed at them and mocked them, and they were weak.

Tragedy

The tragedy of that broke Nehemiah and he began to cry. It didn't last just a little bit. It was for days and weeks. In fact, if I understand it, it went on for about four months.

Much of the time he was fasting and groaning, because God was groaning over the broken walls and the wounded, hurting people, and nobody seemed to care, until God touched a man, Nehemiah, and he was where he ought to be, and he started to cry.

He was broken. I am thrilled to hear some of you are praying with me since you've been reading these articles, that God will give you tears, and that He will make us hunger for God more than we hunger for food, and even sleep.

You'll notice in verse six it went on "day and night".

This was not Nehemiah's burden; it was God's burden. If we ever get in touch with God in what's happening in our culture, in our churches in our days, we're going to cry. We're going to groan. We're going to want Him more than we want food.

Nehemiah's praying also focused in great

Look at verse six: "let Thine ear now be attentive, and Thine eyes open, that Thou mayest hear the prayer of Thy servant, which I pray before Thee now, day and night, for the children of Israel Thy servants, which we have sinned against Thee: both I and my father's house have sinned. We have dealt very corruptly against Thee, and have not kept the commandments, nor the statutes, nor the judgements, which Thou commandest Thy servant Moses".


Who is going to repent? it's the repenter who have to begin it.

Oh, my dear friends, here in Eswatini kingdom and around the world, we have blood in our hands. We have people under the curse of shedding the blood of little innocent, unborn children by the millions!

Who's going to repent over that if we don't, and over the violence; the drug addiction, the apathy, the indifference, the business as usual in our churches, seeking other answers rather than seeking God?

In repentance, we must cry out to God for Him

to change us. You'll notice Nehemiah didn't confess only his sins. That was tremendously important, but he confessed the sins of his nation. And he didn't include only what was going on at that time.

I think he started way back at the time of the Babylonian captivity, and he began to repent for the terrible wickedness of their worship of Baal and their sacrifice of their children to the idols. There was grief in the repentance.

#### FOCUS ON GOD'S PROMISE

The fifth thing is this prayer was focused on God's promises. I love this. Friends, you'll never be the same once you begin to pray promises of God back to Him. We really don't have anything else to pray.

It's what has said that matters. You'll notice that's how Nehemiah prayed.

In verse eight we read: "Remember, I beseech Thee, the word that Thou commandest Thy servant Moses saying, if ye transgress, I will scatter you abroad among the nations: but if ye turn unto Me, and keep My commandments and do them (obedience); though there were of you cast out unto the uttermost part of the heaven, yet will I gather them from thence, and will bring them unto the place that I have chosen to set My name there.

Now, there Thy servants and Thy people whom Thou has redeemed by thy great power" ...

Oh, dear friend, when God hears you begin to pray that great truth about the people He bought with the blood of His son, and you begin to talk to God about what the Word says He wants those people to be, Heaven is shaken.

God is interested. God will move. But it's His word, not your emotions. It's His burden and it's His promises. The final thing is, this prayer was focused on great expectancy. The final verse of chapter one says a little about that.

It says: "O Lord, I beseech you, let now thine ear be attentive to the prayer of thy servant... (by this time more people had joined him) who desire to fear thy name: and prosper, I pray thee, thy servant this day, and grant him mercy in the sight of this man. For I was the king cupbear-

If we didn't read in God's Word, we would almost think it was made up what this man who was a cupbearer to the king had the audacity to expect God to do.

He expected that God would so touch the heart of a heathen king that he would put Nehemiah in charge of a great company of people who would go back to Jerusalem, and God would give him the strength to inspire the people and challenge the people and lead them to rebuild all walls, to rehang those gates and to re-establish a viable, God-honouring government among His people.

The beautiful thing is, God did it.

# COUNTRY'S RESERVES TOO

AS at September 14, the country's reserves had dangerously declined to E6 billion, way below the internationally recommended three months import cover for goods and services.

The Central Bank of Eswatini has attributed the decline in reserves to government, spending coupled with the outflow of rands to neighbouring South Africa. The local currency is currently pegged to the rand on a one-on-one basis. Valued in special drawing rights (SDRs), the This is how the country's gross official reserves fared this year

· In March they declined by 6.5 per cent to reach E6.6 billion, sufficient to cover 3.3months of imports. Year-on-year, reserves fell by 9.9 per cent at the end of March.

· Gross official reserves contracted by 2.8 per cent to E6.7 billion at the end of May 2018, enough to cover 3.2 months of imports. Annually, the reserves declined by 9.1 per cent.

. They stood at E6.7 billion at the end of May reflecting a contraction of 2.8 per cent from April. The import cover fell from 3.3 months to 3.2 months.

In Junecontracted by 7.8 per cent to

reach E6.1 billion at the end of this month. At this level, the reserves represented an import cover of 2.9 months. Annually, the reserves receded by 11.5 per cent.

· Gross official reserves accelerated by 18.7 per cent from the preceding month to reach E7.2 billion at the end of July. Theystood at E6.5 billion at the end of August, 10.5 per cent lower than the preceding month. The reserves were sufficient to cover 3.0 months of imports of goods and services. Year-on-year, the reserves depicted a contraction of 11.8 per cent.

country's reserves have been on a downward spiral since the begin-

ning of the year. In August, they were at E6.5 billion and at this stage, they had declined by 10.5 per cent from the E7.2 billion observed in July. In another matter, the Central Bank reported in its monetary policy statement that the country's deteriorating economic environment had resulted in a decline in credit offered to the private sector, hence its current slow growth.

Also highlighted in this statement is the looming increase in inflation, predicted to peak to 5.6 per cent before the end of the year. The current headline inflation rate is 4.9 per cent.

### RSSC pays E80 million tax

THERE is no doubt about the Royal Swaziland Sugar Corporation (RSSC) being one of the major contributors to the country's public purse with the company's recent E80 million tax pay-out to government.

The same company spent E27. 3 million on staff development while E670.1 million was used to pay staff salaries and wages.

These figures are contained in the recently released integrated annual report. Despite RSSC playing a critical role in boosting government's ailing fiscus in terms of tax revenue, Managing Director Nick Jackson expresses discontent with

the static makeup of the country's sugar industry, 50 years after independence.

"We need new agreements and structure to take us forward for the next period. In our view, the current structure, along with the agreements, are no longer sustainable and this requires ongoing scrutiny and negotiation," he states in the

RSSC also spent handsomely on healthcare services for staff and people from surrounding communities with an estimated E27.1 million resources having been channelled towards people's wellbeing in the past year.

The company's housing plan is currently unmatched in the kingdom with 22 000 people



being catered for.

Apart from growing sugarcane, RSSC is also responsible for its harvesting, processing and refining before the final product, sugar, is distributed to the market. RSSC also does ethanol distilling, distribution, beef production, power generation as well as hospitality.

# STRAY CATTLE DESTROYING MONTIGNY PLANTATIONS

MONTIGNY Investments is still facing a challenge with stray cattle destroying young planted trees.

Speaking at the Montigny Investments chiefs meeting, the company's Managing Director Neal Rijkenberg said unattended cattle continued to be a problem for the company as they eat and damage young trees in the plantations.

"While we have tried several strategies to combat this challenge, stray cattle remains one of our biggest problems," he says.

Montigny Investments is seeking ways of successfully confronting the challenge of stray cattle. Such strategies will not only improve the kingdom's biggest forest plantation company's turnover; the nation as a whole stands to benefit but employment opportunities will further be guaranteed. Currently, Montigny provides employment to at least 10 000 people nationally who are tending to the company's 55 000 hectares of man-made forests.

Some of the strategies that Montigny has employed include the deployment of forest rangers, foresters and cattle monitors at their plantations and communities surrounding them. These strategies have benefited some other entities such as game reserves.

"We have also considered fencing the bor-



ders of the forest. This, without doubt, would be quite expensive, but could benefit us in the long run," Rijkenberg says.

According to Rijkenberg, Montigny has future plans of gradually fencing the plantation perimeter until the whole forest is completely fenced. The plan, he said, was to start off by fencing feeding roads with the entrance points to the forest installed with cattle grids. He also proposed the construction of pound camps at the royal kraals in the different communities. It is worth noting that cattle pound camps are one

of the strategies employed by the central government in keeping stray cattle off the roads; thus Montigny Investments' move to also employ this strategy.

This, he said, would see law enforcement being effected by the chiefs upon their subjects. The company is aware of unacceptable behaviour from the community; thus he pleaded with the chiefs to urge the community members in their jurisdiction to desist from such, which may include stealing the fence bordering these plantations.

#### KPMG nets NDMA performance management system tender

KPMG South Africa is troubled across many fronts, with the firm's publicised fall-out with the Gupta family severely hampering operations.

In the local front, it is business as usual for KPMG as the company has managed to receive a number of tenders, the most recent of which entails conducting a performance management system for the National Disaster Management Agency (NDMA).

Five other companies had shown an interest in this tender, but their bids were outshined by KPMG with a total evaluation score of 88.2 per cent. The other firms which applied for this tender were AM Recruitment, JBH Management Consultancy, Kavana Consulting, Corporater and Kisa and Associates.

Information published in the Swaziland Public Procurement Regulatory Agency (SPPRA) website shows that KPMG's intention to award contract for this tender is worth E161 000.

With 70 per cent, AM Recruitment received the second best evaluation score and this company's bid price as read out was E153 000. All four other companies were not evaluated in this tender, and NDMA

Three companies; M&Q Services, IMED (Pty) Ltd and Touch Hygiene Investment received total evaluation scores

Every year, a selected group of about 3 500 students, business and academic leaders from around the globe meet at ENACTUS World Cup to collectively celebrate the lives being changed around the world.

The final competitions are qualified from over 72 000 university students down to the National Champion teams from 36 countries. ENACTUS SANU Faculty of Education claimed the Eswatini National Championship title in July this year.

Their innovative Super Nova reflector belt won them the title against six teams which took part in the nationals. Through the project, the team has managed to reduce traffic accidents caused by stray cattle, and has generated income for women from Ngculwini.

At the ENACTUS World Cup, each team has 17 minutes to showcase

**THE Eswatini Tourism Authority** (STA) believes the introduction of the Sundowner Tour, an adventure cycling expedition that goes through Eswatini, is a positive development in the growth of adventure tourism in the country.

In an interview, STA Marketing Manager Bongani Dlamini lauded South African Tour Company Escape Cycle Tours, and Eswatini's own Gary Hayter (General Manager at Ngwenya Glass) for what he described as "sterling working in putting together the

tour". "We can only but hope that our country it will go through visitors would get to appreciate our culture, landscape, and wildlife as they cycle through the country. We commend the organisers for this initiative, as we are certain that it will promote Eswatini as a destination of choice for adventure tourism," said Dlamini.

Escape Cycle Tours' Chris Murray revealed that he would be bringing groups to Eswatini every month, with 14 groups already confirmed for 2019. He said each group would consist of about 16 people. The tour, according to Murray, starts in Johannesburg, goes through Eswatini, and ends in Mpumalanga Province. Within the Resort, Foresters Arms Hotel, Mlilwane Wildlife Sanctuary, Nkonyeni Golf Estate, and Mkhaya Game Reserve.

Hayter, on the other hand, said mountain biking was a growing sport in the country as it creates employment and generates income for the country. Hayter said the fact that there were already two bike shops in the country was symbolic of the said growth. He said it was important that various cycling events team up in their marketing efforts, mentioning among others Ingwenya Mountain Challenge, Nedbank Imvelo MTB Classic, and the Logico MTB Cycle Festival.

#### Capitec profits rise 20% despite 'double whammy' economic woes for clients

JOHANNESBURG Capitec Bank [JSE:CPI] reported a 20 per cent rise in half-year profit on Tuesday, with the lender's client base rising to 10.5 million people, representing 109 000 new customers every month over the period.

The bank released its unaudited financial results for the six months ended August 2018 yesterday.

Capitec CEO Gerrie Fourie said the company was pleased with client growth to August, with a significant number of new high income customers joining the low cost, no-frills bank in the tough economic climate.

In an interview with Fin24 on Tuesday, Fourie said the rising cost of living, combined with bonuses and overtime payments decreasing, created a "double whammy" for clients, forcing them to take on credit. According to Fourie, the bank had to take a conservative approach to debt in the current economic environment, with the value of loan sales growing by four per cent in the six months to August 2018, while the net loan book was up by three per

Capitec was launched in 2001 as a micro-lending business, and has moved to operate as a fully-fledged

bank with savings, insurance and credit options. Fourie said it was a "journey" to cut the costs of unsecured credit.


The lowest interest rate given by Capitec on loans not linked to assets is 12.9 per cent, which Fourie compares positively to the prime lending rate of 10 per cent granted by banks to customers with strong credit records for home loans and other forms of secured credit.

Capitec represents just five per cent of total credit in South African financial institutions, and Capitec is hoping to increase its share of this. Contrasted with other banks such

as FNB or newcomers Bank Zero and Thyme Digital, Fourie still sees a strong role for "brick-and-mortar" bank branches. He says they signed up all 654 000 new clients over the last six months. The process takes 10 minutes in real time and includes taking a clients' biometric details and verifying them, according to the Financial Intelligence Centre Act (FICA). Nonetheless, Capitec, which mostly caters to the lower income segment, has 1.8 million people using its digital application. a 62 per cent increase in the six months to August. Fin24

# The Impact of Technology on Tourism

In social terms, digitalisation is expected to continue propelling the travel experience on its trajectory towards becoming more seamless, frictionless, and high quality.

The use of technologies including the 'Internet of Things', location-based services, artificial intelligence, augmented and virtual reality, and block-chain technology (see definitions below) has resulted in a tourism offer that is more attractive, efficient, inclusive, and economically, socially and environmentally sustainable than its predecessor. It has also facilitated innovation and rethinking of processes, with a view to tackling challenges such as seasonality and overcrowding and developing smarter destinations.

Digitalization has a positive environmental impact and can yet have a greater one, with innovations in manufacturing, smart assets and efficient use of resources contributing to a more sustainable industry footprint. Some major impacts on the sector as a whole are the development of smart travel facilitation, smart destinations, and a new wave of job profiles

#### Smart travel facilitation

In the same way the smartphone has transformed telecommunications and media, a comprehensive smart travel model - one that includes smart visas, borders, security processes and infrastructure - will revolutionise tourism. With consolidation of these tools, passengers can book their flights and check in online, have their boarding passes on their smartphones, go through automated clearance gates and even validate their boarding passes electronically to board planes. These measures improve both travel facilitation and security.

#### Smart destinations

A smart destination is one with a strategy for technology, innovation, sustainability, accessibility and inclusivity along the entire tourism cycle: before, during and after the trip. A smart destination is also one with residents as well as tourists in mind, factoring multilingualism, cultural idiosyncrasies and seasonality into tourism planning.

This is why smart destinations are key to the transformation of the tourism sector. By continuously and accurately measuring, integrating and analysing data for efficient decision-making, prioritization and anticipation of challenges, they create a seamless and exciting experience for tourists while managing local resources efficiently.

Smart destinations can make tourism governance more inclusive through inclusive entities, such as boards, trusts or foundations, which represent all public/private stakeholders in the destination. They can help ensure maximum accessibility in sites, products and services, eliminating barriers to mobility. And they allow us to analyse sustainable tourism management through different lenses.

Consider, for example, the challenge of seasonality, where population change from variation in tourist flows makes tourism's impact difficult to measure. Technology-based data tools, such as remote sensors and big data management systems, can help destination managers capture and process large volumes of data for a greater understanding of the impact of seasonality on tourism and on sustainability. It can therefore help them to predict and manage tourist flows in order to more efficiently and effectively manage destinations.

#### Job creation

The future of travel is technology-based, so tourism jobs will require both technical and advanced soft skills used to effectively implement and manage smart initiatives. The greatest societal impact of digital transformation in tourism may be the effect on the sector's workforce, which directly and indirectly represents 1 in every 10 jobs worldwide. Like in other economic sectors, intelligent automation will change the nature of some travel jobs and eradicate others altogether. However, digitally-enabled growth will also generate new employment opportunities that could outpace the automation of existing roles, especially as strong growth is forecast for the sector.

Startups and micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) - drivers of technology-based innovation and entrepreneurship in tourism - will take on an increasingly important role in developing the skills needed for the jobs of the future. The sector should therefore prioritize strengthening startups and MSMEs so they can become integral parts of the tourism value chain, and boosting technology- and skills-based education, training and policies that stimulate innovation and decent employment.

# Technology in the hospitality Industry – Exploring the very latest trends

echnology is advancing at a faster pace than ever before, and this is changing both the expectations of patrons as well as the way in which the hospitality industry conducts its business

Some of the trends in industry are leading to great improvements and savings for hospitality industry companies; while some are changing how hotel developers plan their buildings, infrastructure, management structure and staffing requirements. These are some of the latest trends in industry:

#### Wi-Fi infrastructure overhauls

Nowadays, hotel guests who travel with devices such as phones, tablets and computers no longer see Wi-Fi as a perk, but as a must-have when they check in at a hotel.

Hotel guests expect to be able to connect to the internet seamlessly and without too many interruptions, leading hotels to invest in better, faster Wi-Fi infrastructure so that people can do business and use their technology devices with ease when they book their stay.

Hotels are also starting to move away from user pay models. In the past, hotels could charge exorbitant rates and guests knew they would have to pay if they wanted to go online. Installing and maintaining a hotel-wide wireless network may be coupled with costs, but many leading hotel groups have started to install high density Wi-Fi and started to offer in-building mobile phone coverage as guests have come to expect these services during their stay (not only for themselves, but also for their guests if they are hosting a conference or function at the hotel). It might not yet be financially feasible for hotels to completely abandon the user pay model, but many of them are re-thinking their current infrastructure and pricing models.

#### Digital conference facilities

Besides being able to offer high density Wi-Fi for conferences and meetings, hotels also need to be able to offer access to audio-visual (AV) and digital facilities for conferences. While the amount of AV and digital equipment that goes into a typical conference room is fairly minimal, staging companies are often hired for various projects in order to equip the facility as required.

A key component in designing effective conference facilities that can accommodate this type of technology is creating easily accessible, concealed pathways in ceilings and flooring where adequate power and data connectivity can be facilitated. If a hotel has extensive conference facilities, network design becomes critical to ensure indoor mobile phone coverage, Wi-Fi connectivity, VoIP, real time location services (RTLS) and internet protocol television (IPTV) as well as all the accompanying AV and digital equipment.

#### Feedback on social media

Technology has infiltrated almost every aspect of

our lives and hotel developers need to realise that almost any person checking in at a hotel, resort, spa or lodge, will have a smartphone in their pockets. Many companies in the hospitality industry are already using social media to their advantage as guests check-in on location-based social media apps, tweet about their experience on Twitter and share their holiday photos with friends and followers on Instagram and Facebook.

This trend will continue and hotels can expect to see even more social media engagement from guests who use these platforms to give feedback about their experience, complain and give compliments about their stay. Hotel staff are also expected to provide feedback and address and complaints or queries from guests in real-time.

From an online, reputation management perspective, this is a trend that marketers and hotel management need to manage proactively. Consumers don't make decisions about where they're going to travel to or book a stay in a vacuum — they turn to community-developed content and rating systems such as Trip Advisor and social media to make decisions about holiday destinations, hotels and leisure.

This shift has led to many hotel and leisure groups developing active social media monitoring and communication strategies in order to stay on top of what's being said about them online and making sure that both marketing and operational staff address feedback that has been given online. An additional way in which operator can take full advantage of technology in this space is using it to communicate how well they are doing (in real time) with respect to their various environmental initiatives (such as real time electricity/water usage reporting, etc.)

#### Integrated, seamless experiences

Technology doesn't mean that customer experience can only happen online and through devices, check-ins and online comments. All of these experiences need to be part of an integrated, dynamic system so that the guests' experiences are at the forefront of the marketing and operational team's mind. If a guest leaves a comment about their stay when they check-out of the hotel, for example, the right people need to reply and acknowledge this type of communication.

If a guest leaves a complaint about not being able to stream mobile content during their stay, then processes should be put in place to ensure the right person follows up by communicating with the guest and solving the problem at the hotel.

Marketing, management and hotel developers can no longer work in silos and these technology trends are giving them the opportunities, tools and solutions they need to create memorable experiences that can lead to positive change and growth in the industry.

# Digital Transformation Trends in Hospitality and Tourism

In the past few months, we've been looking at digital transformation trends in different industries like healthcare, retail, finance, and media and entertainment.

**Mobile Integration** 

The digital transformation is a dream come true for introverts who like to travel. With mobile-first and mobile-only brands continuing to grow, customers can do practically anything on their phone, from checking in—to ordering room service—to unlocking the room door itself. In fact, one can plan an entire trip—from booking to bedtime and home again—without ever talking to a live human.

#### Al and Chatbots

Remember when all hotels used to have clunky welcome binders on the desks, outlining where to eat, what to see, and what to do in the area—everything you needed to know? Today, hotels can provide all that information—and more—via AI-powered apps and technology. Guests can access the information at any time they need, right from their phones in the form of an e-concierge.

They can even access voice-activated chat bots to open the curtains, set the alarm, or order breakfast, without ever talking to a human being. At the Cosmopolitan in Las Vegas, you can even text a robot named Rose at any time, 24/7, and she'll find a way to fill your request, fast. Meanwhile, Marriott has been using AI-powered chat bots at nearly 5,000 hotels to do

things like make reservation changes, and check on account balances or redemption vouchers.

#### Integration of the IoT

As more and more devices get connected to the Internet of Things (IoT), it makes sense that the tourism and hospitality industry would begin to harness that data to improve the customer experience.

After all, the more they know about their guests, the better they can please them. If the IoT data tells them the customer has visited their resort every year for the last three years, it can automatically send a message proactively asking the guest if they'd like to make another booking this year. You just saved your customer a step—and guaranteed a booked room—without ever lifting a finger.

The same could be said by harnessing information about food selection, excursions, and in-room amenities. The opportunities for up-sells and better CX are endless.

As noted above, data is going to play a huge part in the new era of hospitality and tourism.

In the case of AirBnB, they were able to use customer data to determine that

guests who chose not to book were doing so because they were discouraged by hosts who failed to respond to their inquiries. (I've been there—it's annoying.)

By offering instant booking feature to guarantee their reservation, they helped alleviate many of the customers' concerns and helped automate what had previously been an incredibly arduous part of their business model. Data didn't just improve CX. It improves the bottom line, as well.

#### Reputation

The fact that guests can book instantly also means they can share their opinions instantly via Facebook, Yelp, Trip Advisor and other travel review websites. That's why technology has pushed hotels and restaurants to focus even more on providing quality customer service. Yes, there are outliers. I've experienced them myself. But there is no doubt the trend is toward better service for guests—not just a better return for operators.

#### Virtual Reality

Whether it's a hotel property, museum, or a tourist destination, guests can take a look without even leaving their living room via virtual reality. The goal is either to offer a preview of what

guests will experience—or offer the next-best-thing to visiting at all.


(For instance, would you rather pay \$4,000 to visit Paris in real life, or \$200 to take the same trip in a virtual world?) This isn't being done on a widespread scale yet, but some major operators are offering guests the chance to experience at least a snippet of their travel experience — offering greater piece of mind especially to those planning a visit to a faraway destination.

Others destinations, like the Museum of Modern Art in New York (MOMA) are already offering VR installations as part of their exhibits.


The travel and tourism business is a \$1.2 trillion industry. Clearly, there is incentive to invest to grow it even more. The Duke of Cambridge was in Namibia on Tuesday and will visit Tanzania and Kenya. On Monday, he met Namibian Vice-President Nangolo Mbumba. The prince's weeklong trip ends on Sunday. Kensington Palace says Prince William is making the "private working trip" as President of the United for Wildlife group and patron of Tusk, another conservation organisation. AP

#### Elephant poaching crisis under scrutiny

GABORONE - Reports of elephant poaching in Botswana are under the spotlight with various claims in national and international media that the current adverse situation is driven by anti-poaching budget cuts, disarming of anti-poaching units, poachers being spoilt for choice with wildlife finding a safe-haven in the country, and even the trophy hunting ban.

There is no doubt that these factors play some part in the rising elephant poaching incidents in Botswana. However, wildlife poaching, and in particular the poaching of elephants, is not unique to Botswana and has significantly reduced elephant populations across the African continent. In 2014, conservationists raised concerns that the poaching syndicates decimating the East and Central African elephant populations, would move further south, making southern Africa their next target.

# EX-ZIM MINISTER ARRESTED FOR ABUSE OF OFFICE


HARARE - Zimbabwean former first lady Grace Mugabe's ally has reportedly been arrested on charges of criminal abuse of office during his two tenures as a minister under former president Robert Mugabe's era.

According to the state-owned Chronicle newspaper, Saviour Kasukuwere spent a night in prison on Monday on four counts of criminal abuse of office.

He was, however, freed on \$3 000 bail, coupled with some strict bail conditions on Tuesday, New Zimbabwe reported.

Harare Magistrate Hosiah Mujaya ordered him to surrender his passport and title deeds to his house in Nyanga, report to police once a week and not to interfere with state witnesses, the report said.

Kasukuwere was facing three counts of criminal abuse of office during his tenure as local government minister and another count as indigenisation minister. According to NewsDay, Kasukuwere was linked to various fraudulent land deals, among them dishing out vast tracts of



land worth over \$2m to Grace Mugabe's sister, Shuvai Gumbochuma, without following due process. Gumbochuma was arrested on the same issue last week and was released on a \$500 bail, which was coupled with tough bail conditions. It was alleged that in 2014, Gumbochuma successfully applied for state land worth more than \$400 000 to develop into stands for low-cost housing in Harare. She "fraudulently" acquired the land in March 2015 from the local government ministry after

submitting false documents which claimed she had the capacity to develop the lands. But instead of developing the land, she allegedly sold it to another land developer for more than \$2 million, a Herald report said.

"Gumbochuma profiteered from state land thereby distorting the market value of the land from a mere \$424 426 to an inflated value of \$2 060 000 without making any developments," the Herald said, citing state papers.

#### Zimb boys' school teacher discloses that he is gay

Harare - A Zimbabwean high school teacher has triggered a furore after coming out to pupils and parents as gay to pre-empt a newspaper story that would have outed him.

Neal Hovelmeier, a teacher at the private St John's College in Harare, and Headmaster Cavaliere Corrado Trinci wrote a letter revealing his homosexuality to parents after announcing it during assembly at the boys only school.

Homosexuality is illegal in Zimbabwe. St John's College made the disclosure after the independent Daily News sent in media questions about the teacher. Hovelmeier said he made the decision in the hope it would curb homophobic behaviour after some former pupils who had gained confi-

dence after school to pursue their sexual orientation told him how they had "intolerance, intimidation and homophobia" while at St John's. The sixth form teacher's admission sparked heated debate countrywide and on social media, with some critics saying the school should not have assembled pupils to make the disclosure.

#### Mnangagwa 'offers Trump land to build stateof-the-art golf course'

WASHINGTON - Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa has reportedly disclosed that he offered President Donald Trump a piece of land in Victoria Falls to build a state-of-the-art golf course.

According to NewsDay, Mnangagwa revealed his offer to Trump at the Zimbabwe's Investors Forum in New York.

"When I was in Davos, I met staffers from the Trump administration. I had hoped to meet President Trump but I had to leave before he arrived. But I told his people that if President Trump wishes, I will offer him ground in Victoria Falls in the national park.

"We have wildlife national park in Victoria Falls, but I had offered President Trump ground to build a state-of-the-art golf course so that as he plays, he can be able to see the big five," Mnangagwa was quoted as saying. It appeared the land offer to Trump was part of Mnangagwa's administration at normalising relations between the two countries, the report said.

The two countries have had a huge fallout after the European Union and the United States imposed sanctions against Zimbabwe in 2000, as they accused ex-president Robert Mugabe of trampling on human rights, rigging elections and repression of press freedom - accusations that the nonagenarian denied

The sanctions led to devastating economic challenges, with the country reportedly now sitting with about 85 per cent unemployed.

According to Daily News, Trump – billionaire president – owned at least 19 pristine and private golf courses around the world.

Trump's business empire was influential

Trump's business empire was influential across the world, said the report.

Mnangagwa was expected to give his first speech at the United Nations General Assembly this week. He has also met with Zimbabweans in the diaspora and has given interviews to international media outlets that included CNN.

#### WHO suspends Ebola work in Congo, amid militant attacks

GENEVA - The World Health Organisation (WHO) is suspending parts of its effort to fight Ebola in the Congo after a string of attacks by militants, the UN agency said on Tuesday.

Ebola has claimed 100 lives since the deadly virus outbreak started nearly two months ago in North Kivu, a north-eastern border region where more than 100 armed groups operate.

After 21 people died in an attack by the Allied Democratic Forces rebels in the city of Beni on Saturday, community groups called for days of mourning and protests that are expected to last at least until tomorrow.

WHO staff are confined to hotels and their operating centre in Beni for security reasons so their ability to track potential new infections has fallen sharply, WHO's emergency response chief Peter Salama told a press conference in Geneva.

"We are now extremely concerned that several factors may be coming together in the next weeks or months to create a potentially perfect storm," the Australian epidemiologist added.

In addition to the security risk, a minority of the local population is deeply mistrustful of government and UN health workers. Some potentially infected people have fled treatment.

Politicians in the region are also stoking the mistrust ahead of upcoming elections in December, Salama said on Tuesday.

As a result, the outbreak has spread over a wider region, including an area bordering Uganda.

Now he has gone back to the Inkatha Freedom Party (IFP) - the party he left after a public feud with its leader Mangosuthu Buthelezi over its direction in 2005

Jiyane confirmed on his Facebook status on Sunday that he had rejoined the IFP.

Responding to a question from Sifiso Shabalala on whether it was true that he had returned to the IFP, Jiyane said: "It's true Mshengu, as uMntwana [Prince Mangosuthu Buthelezi] said them was built by him, but he was building his father Luthuli's home."

Jiyane was referring to the late former ANC president Chief Albert Luthuli who enjoyed a good relationship with Buthelezi.

He didn't respond to queries from Times Live about which branch he had joined and when, and what role he intended to serve in the party.

IFP MP and national spokesman Mkhuleko Hlengwa said the party had heard that Jiyane had claimed he had rejoined the IFP. "When we secure the monthly reports from branches be duly noted. Nobody joins the party on Facebook. If it's true, Dr Jiyane will associate himself with the nearest branch as the party constitution

However, Hlengwa said before rejoining the IFP, Jiyane would have to explain the circumstances under which he had left the party.

"Circumstances under which he left are still uncleared. So as a political courtesy, he owes the party, himself and South Africa an explanation. And it would do himself a favour to do

so." Hlengwa also made it clear that Jiyane would not be given any special treatment but would have to follow party procedures like any other person who wanted to join the IFP.

In January this year the embattled NFP, led by its ailing founder Zanele KaMagwaza-Msibi, issued a statement, saying Jiyane would be unveiled as a new member which would have become the former IFP national chairman's seventh political home in as many years after the failure of his National Democratic Convention (NADECO). But this was quickly dismissed by those close to Jiyane as untrue and the supposed move did not materialise. Jiyane formed NADECO, which was mainly made up of IFP dissidents, after a public spat with Buthelezi over the direction of the party. Before joining the IFP, he was a member of the Pan Africanist Congress.

The IFP's splinter party exploded onto the national political scene in 2005 after it scooped eight parliamentary seats, five in the National Assembly and four in the KZN provincial Legislature, without a single vote being cast - thanks to Jiyane's skillful use of the floor-crossing window period.



# UNIS THE MOST POWERF NSTRUMENT WE POSSESS'

NEW YORK - The reform of the United Nations, and particularly its Security Council, is a priority if we are to give full effect to the values and principles enshrined in the UN Charter, President Cyril Ramaphosa said in his debut address to the General Assembly of the body in New York on Tuesday.

South Africa would like to see the Security Council increased to 15 members and for Africa to have two permanent members on the council since most conflicts happen on the African continent.

"Institutions like the United Nations, World Bank, IMF (International Monetary Fund) and the WTO (World Trade Organisation) need to be reshaped and enhanced so that they may more effectively meet the challenges of the contemporary world and better serve the interests of the poor and marginalised," Ramaphosa



"The call to leave no one behind requires that we strengthen the institutions of global governance and make them more responsive to the needs of young people, particularly in the developing world.

"It is within our hands, as the leaders assembled here today, to forge a more representative, equal and fair United Nations that is empowered and equipped to lead the struggle to end poverty, unemployment and inequality in the

He said to the poor, vulnerable and marginalised that the UN was a beacon of promise in a landscape of doubt.

"To billions across the world, the UN is the most powerful instrument we possess to achieve a more equal, more humane and more inclusive world."

In his speech, Ramaphosa often referred to former president Nelson Mandela.

"We are a young world, where more than half the global population is under the age of 30 years. This is even more pronounced on our continent, Africa, where twothirds of its people were not yet born when Nelson Mandela was released from prison," he said. "We are living in the Age of Youth. This places a responsibility on us, as leaders, not only to put the interests of young people at the centre of our efforts, but to empower women and young people to be more prominent in directing the course of global affairs."

#### Mantashe to unpack finalised Mining Charter today

PRETORIA - Minister of Mineral Resources Gwede Mantashe will today morning brief members of the media on the finalised version of the Mining Charter.

The long-awaited release of a renewed charter comes a week after Minister of Communications Nomvula Mokonyane confirmed that it had been approved by Cabinet.


The charter caused bad blood between industry employers organisation the Chamber of Mines and former mining minister Mosebenzi Zwane, with the chamber - now the Minerals Council South Africa - threatening court action to stop it being instituted.

It took the intervention of President Cyril Ramaphosa in February to bring both parties back to the negotiating table. Ramaphosa named Gwede Mantashe as new Minister of Mineral Resources in late February.

In June, Mantashe committed to developing a charter which would ensure mine workers and mining communities reaped the benefits of mining companies' operations, while shielding companies from unnecessary volatility. In July, the department held a summit to discuss latest version of the Charter with the industry and social partners. A draft version of the charter for public comment was published shortly

Union Solidarity told Fin24 that it was confident that the latest version of the charter would have as few points of contention as possible for the mining sector and labour.

### Cape driver who helped girl at 'death's door' slapped with R6k fine

R6 000 for trying to save the life of a child who had 10 epileptic

Jack Arthur Williams, 40, says the girl was at "death's door" as he was rushing her and her mother to Red Cross Children's Hospital.

But before they could get there, traffic police pulled him over, gave him a fat fine and confiscated his professional driving permit.

"I told him [the officer] this is an emergency. I said if he doesn't want me to drive, then he can take the child, but he said he isn't an ambulance," says the upset driver.

Jack, who is the son of the head

CAPE TOWN - A Mitchells Plain of the Mitchells Plain Taxi Association hospital. The 12 passengers said taxi driver says he has been fined and himself a dad of six, says he had been travelling along Eisleben Road in Lentegeur last Thursday just after 7am when he was flagged down by a frantic 37-year-old woman, who had her 13-year-old daughter with her.

He says the desperate mother asked him to rush to Red Cross because her child had suffered several epileptic seizures and they could not wait for an ambulance.

He says the girl's tongue had started turning blue and her eyes were rolled back in her head.

"When I saw what condition the child was in, I didn't hesitate, I asked the passengers if I can take her to 'driver, drive!""

Jack says he knew he would probably encounter traffic officials at that time of the morning and put on his hazards as he drove on the shoulder of the road.

He was stopped by the police along Thornton Road.

Jack says a "heartless" traffic officer ordered him to hand over his licence and permit and to remove the child from the vehicle, despite him explaining that it was a medical emergency.

He says he then jumped out of the taxi, grabbed the child and he, the child and her mother, caught another taxi to the hospital.

"I left the taxi there because I am a father and this is a life," he explains.

He says a sympathetic doctor gave him a letter stating he had saved the girl's life.

The letter reads: "Mr Jack Arthur Williams was escorting the patient to hospital as she was having epileptic seizures and he needed to get the patient to hospital as her airways were compromised."

Jack says when he returned to his taxi, he was fined R6 000 for inconsiderate driving and his PDP was returned.

The child's mother, who asked not to be identified, says Jack is her hero, and is asking authorities to scrap the fine. Daily Voice

# BRITISH ARTIST'S 'TIDAL' ART GALLERY RESORT DESTROYED

MALDIVES - Police armed with pickaxes and power tools have destroyed the world's first tidal gallery at a holiday resort in the Maldives after it was deemed 'offensive to Islam'.

The gallery, at the Fairmont Maldives Sirru Fen Fushi, which opened in July, featured semi-submerged exhibits that disappeared and reappeared as the tide went in and out.

But Abdulla Yameen, the outgoing president of the tourist nation, home to 340 000 Sunni Muslims, ordered the sculptures to be demolished. Islam, the official religion in the Maldives, bans the depiction of idols, and the work provoked some criticism from clerics even though the statues have no religious symbols or meaning.

Yameen made the order in July, but his ruling was not acted upon until last Friday, the eve of a presidential election, which he lost to a liberal candidate.

The artwork, known as the Coralarium, was designed by British artist Jason deCaires Taylor.

Resort guests could swim from the shore to an underwater realm of human-shaped figures.

It was claimed the gallery structure would act as a sheltered space that offers a permanent sanctuary for ocean life such as fish, crustaceans, octopuses and marine invertebrates.

In the evening, an integrated light system illuminated the gallery and attracted marine life while creating an impressive sight from the island shore. The Maldives is still beautiful, with a warm and friendly population, but it was a sad day for art and sad day for the environment.

A spokesperson from the Fairmont Maldives said: "While we are very surprised by the sudden removal of eco-art pieces by the authorities we respect the people, traditions and customs of the Maldives.

The removal process of the installed artwork was peaceful and friendly without interruption to our world famous service.

and the tree lined underwater coral boulevard remains intact, ensuring the coral restoration programme remains alive and well. We have initiated immediate plans for the next exhibit, creating a new attraction within the Coralarium gallery."

The import of statues is prohibited in the Maldives. Even depictions of the Buddha are banned despite a long legacy of Buddhism on the islands before Islam came to dominate the archipelago.

Despite the edict, huge cutouts of Yameen towered over the capital Male in the lead-up to Sunday's poll, which he lost after five years of strongman rule marked by a regression from democracy. Many of these cardboard posters depicting the ousted leader were torn down after he suffered a shock defeat to opposition candidate Ibrahim Mohamed Solih, an act of defiance unthinkable under his iron-fisted leader-

ship. Sunday's election was held with all key opposition leaders behind bars or in exile, leaving the little-known Ibrahim Mohamed Solih to challenge Yameen. In a major upset, Solih won with 58 per cent of the vote. Solih's victory was greeted warmly by India as Yameen had drifted closer to China, borrowing heavily from New Delhi's regional rival to invest in infrastructure.

Declaring victory, Solih demanded Yameen immediately release all political prisoners in the country. A Maldivian court freed five of them on Monday night. Many more are still in jail, including Yameen's estranged half-brother and former president Maumoon Abdul Gayoom, 80, who is expected to be released shortly. Under intense international pressure, Yameen conceded defeat and pledged to allow a peaceful transition when he formally steps down on November 17. *Daily Mail* 

### SCULPTOR, ENVIRONMENTALIST: A PROFILE OF BRITISH ARTIST JASON

BRITISH artist Jason deCaires Taylor describes himself as a sculptor, environmentalist and professional underwater photographer.

He studied sculpture at the London Institute of Arts and has since created artwork that has been displayed all over the world.

Mr deCaires Taylor is bestknown for creating semi-submerged sculptures that are revealed and hidden again depending upon the tides.

He designed the first underwater sculpture park off the coast of Grenada in the Caribbean, which has been listed among the Top 25 Wonders of the World by National Geographic.

His biggest project to date is the Cancun Underwater Museum in Mexico.

Each of the 460 statues in the underwater exhibition are made from PH-neutral marine concrete designed to encourage marine plants to grow and attract fish to the region, and the museum was set up to draw tourists away from nearby coral reefs.

His other major works include a collection of 300 submerged sculptures in Lanzarote, the first of its kind in Europe.

He also created The Rising Tide series of horse sculptures, which are semi-submerged in London's River Thames close to the MI6 secret service headquarters, and 'Ocean Atlas' the largest ever underwater sculpture off the Bahamas.

However, Yameen said in July that 'significant public sentiment' against the artwork known as 'Coralarium' had guided his decision to destroy it.

It is unclear why the sculptures were not raised from the waters until Friday, just two days before Yameen was turfed out of office.

Police were photographed chipping away at the works with pickaxes and using power tools to remove them from the large and ornate cage housing them.

A video posted by state media showed several men tearing a statue off a plinth. Artist Mr deCaires Taylor told AFP in a statement: 'I was extremely shocked and heartbroken to learn that my sculptures have been destroyed by the Maldivian

authorities at the Coralarium, despite continued consultations and dialogue. 'The Coralarium was conceived to connect humans

UNITED NATIONS - US President Donald Trump got some laughter when he addressed world leaders on Tuesday.


It wasn't intentional.

He said the American economy was "booming like never before" and that his administration has accomplished more in less than two years than almost any other administration.

His boast elicited laughter from the scores of heads of state and delegates in the audience for the speech.

Trump, who has long claimed that his predecessors' weak leadership prompted other nations "to laugh" at the US appeared flustered and responded: "I didn't expect that reaction, but that's okay."

A little further into his speech, German diplomats appeared bemused by Trump's latest swipe at their country as he reiterated his criticism of Germany's planned undersea gas pipeline from Russia.

After the president's warning that "Germany will become totally dependent on Russian energy if it does not immediately change course", cameras showed German Foreign Minister Heiko Maas gently shaking his head, while senior diplomats smiled.

Some in the audience also grumbled during Trump's remarks when he said "we reject the ideology" of globalism. When Trump criticised socialism, a member of the Swedish delegation frowned with disapproval. AFP

#### Murdered millionaire accused of hiring hitmen

THAILAND - A British millionaire and his wife were on Tuesday found buried in their garden in Thailand, as police revealed three hitmen had confessed to murdering them for just £400 (R7 500) each. Alan Hogg, 64, was blasted with a shotgun near his swimming pool while his Thai wife Nott, 61, was bludgeoned to death with a hammer in the garage – allegedly on her brother's orders. Their bodies were discovered five days after they were reported missing, buried six feet deep next to a duck pond at their dream retirement mansion in Phrae, northern Thailand.

#### Men wanted for killing kangaroos

SYDNEY - The hunt for the three men comes on the heels of an arrest made after sickening footage of a driver running over emus.

Three men accused of torturing and killing kangaroos are being hunted by police in Australia, just days after a man was arrested for intentionally mowing down emus in another high-profile animal cruelty case. Police in Western Australia yesterday released images of the men wanted for questioning over separate incidents in June and May during which "two kangaroos were tortured and killed". AFP

#### Trump accused of trying to 'topple' Iran leader

UNITED NATIONS

US President Donald Trump called for Iran's international isolation in a combative and



unashamedly boastful speech at the United Nations, prompting accusations from his Iranian counterpart that he was trying to topple his government. In his second appearance before the General Assembly, Trump also lashed out at other adversaries such as Venezuela's Nicolas Maduro and took aim at international institutions such as the UNbacked world court. AFP

#### Jaylon faces jail time for spitting on pizza

DETROIT - Jaylon Kerley has been charged after he was caught on camera spitting on pizza dough he was preparing at a concession stand in Comerica Park in Detroit in the US.WXYZ reports Kerley has been charged with one count of Food Law Violations, a 4year felony, and a lesser charge which could lead to three months in jail. During a court appearance on Tuesday, he was given a \$100 000/10 per cent bond. FOX2 reports the judge ruled Kerley must also get medically tested, including a hepatitis panel, which is an array of tests used to detect hepatitis infections. Reuter

#### Cop pinned by cow uses stun gun to free himself

ARIZONA - Authorities in northeastern Arizona say a sheriff's deputy used a stun gun to drive off a large cow that was stepping on him in a field after he rescued another person pinned to the ground by the cow. The Navajo County Sheriff's Office said on Tuesday that a female telephoned for help while pinned last Friday as the cow was "continually pressing her" if she moved or tried to get away. A statement said the deputy used his stun gun to get the cow to release the woman but that it then charged him, striking his chest and forcing him to the ground before he was able to again use his stun gun to drive away the cow. AFP

#### Malaysia ex-PM's wife grilled by corruption investigators

MALAYSIA - The luxury-loving wife of Malaysia's former prime minister faced fresh questioning yesterday by anti-corruption investigators probing a multi-billion-dollar scandal that contributed to the old regime losing power.

Rosmah Mansor, widely reviled in Malaysia for her expensive tastes and imperious manner, arrived at the offices of the Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) to

Local media reported this week that anticorruption officials were wrapping up their probe into Rosmah, and she could be charged

It was the second time she has been quizzed by the graft-fighting body since her husband Najib Razak's coalition was unexpectedly booted out of office at elections in May after six decades in power.

A major factor in the loss were allegations that Najib, his family and his cronies looted billion of dollars from state fund 1MDB in an audacious fraud that stretched from Singapore to Switzerland.

Rosmah's love of costly overseas shopping trips, designer handbags and jewellery made her a lightning rod for public anger, and fuelled suspicions that she benefitted from the plundering of 1MDB.

After the election loss, a stash of cash, jewellery and hundreds of designer handbags worth as much as \$273m was seized from properties linked to Najib in raids around Kuala Lumpur.

Fate of detained US pastor in court's hands

New York - Turkish President Tayyip Erdogan said a Turkish court, not politicians, will decide the fate of an American pastor whose detention on terrorism charges has roiled relations between Ankara and Washington.

US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo said on Monday he was hopeful Turkey would release evangelical pastor Andrew Brunson this month. He was moved to house arrest in July after being detained for 21 months.

In an interview on Tuesday while he was in New York for the annual United Nations General Assembly meetings, Erdogan said any decision on Brunson would be made by the court.

"This is a judiciary matter. Brunson has been detained on terrorism charges ... On October 12 there will be another hearing and we don't know what the court will decide and politicians will have no say on the verdict," Erdogan said. If found guilty, Brunson could be jailed for up

to 35 years. He denies the charges. "As the president, I don't have the right to order his release. Our judiciary is independent. Let's wait and see what the court will decide," Erdogan said.

US President Donald Trump, infuriated over Brunson's detention, authorised a doubling of duties on aluminum and steel imported from Turkey in August. Turkey retaliated by increasing tariffs on U.S. cars, alcohol and tobacco imports.

### Argentina's central bank chief resigns

**BUENOS AIRES - The pres**ident of Argentina's central bank, Luis Caputo, abruptly resigned on Tuesday after just a few months in the position, amid a volatile economic cri-

resignation, which the bank said was for 'personal reasons,' came as President Mauricio Macri was trying to negotiate accelerated IMF funding from a \$50billion (R750-billion) loan agreed three months ago to help stabilize Argentina's economy.

Macri is currently in New York, attending the United Nations General Assembly, while back home discontent is growing as a 24-hour general strike paralysed the country. The central bank said in a statement announcing Caputo's resignation that he was doing so with the convic-



tion that a "new agreement with the International Monetary Fund will restore confidence in the fiscal, financial, monetary and exchange situation." But analysts said there were already rumors he would resign due to "a disagreement with the IMF over monetary policy," according to Argentine economist Gabriel

Rubinstein. Caputo is close to the center-right Macri and was finance minister before he was appointed president of the central bank in June. Another economist, Fausto Spotorno said Caputo was never seen as a longterm fixture and that "the government's priority is an agreement with the IMF." AFP

Pogba and Mourinho frosty training ground exchange

MANCHESTER - Footage has emerged of a frosty training ground exchange between Paul Pogba and Manchester United Manager Jose Mourinho after their shock Carabao Cup exit to Derby.

Footage revealed by Sky Sports shows the two men exchanging less-thanfriendly words with Pogba reacting to something Mourinho said as the player arrived on the Carrington training pitch. After their shock defeat to Derby, Mourinho confirmed that Pogba had

been stripped of the vice-captaincy as tensions between United's star midfielder and manager continue to rise.

Pogba deputised as skipper in the absence of club captain Antonio Valencia on three occasions this season against Leicester and Brighton in the Premier League and a Champions League trip to Young Boys. However, the French World Cup winner's latest outspoken comments criticising United's overly negative tactics after a 1-1 draw at home to newly-promoted Wolves on

Saturday have provoked a reaction from Mourinho. "The only truth is I made the decision of Paul not to be the second captain anymore," said Mourinho after Tuesday's League Cup defeat to Derby on penalties for which Pogba was rested. "I am the manager and I make these decisions, no fall out at all, no problem at all. The same personwho takes the decision to make him second captain makes this decision now."

## Loew blocked from meeting Mesut Ozil at Arsenal training

Joachim Loew was reportedly blocked from meeting Mesut Ozil at Arsenal's training ground on Monday to discuss the midfielder's fiery retirement from international duty. Loew and Germany's team Direc-

tor Oliver Bierhoff were in London at the weekend to take part in a FIFA coaching congress and then visited Arsenal's training ground in Colney, north of London, for clear-the-air talks with Ozil. According to German daily Bild, Loew and Bierhoff were turned away at the entrance to Arsenal's training ground, on the orders of Gunners'

head coach Unai Emery, while the squad was put through a recovery session. The visit had been previously arranged, so Loew and Bierhoff later met the Gunners' Germany internationals Bernd Leno and Shkodran Mustafi at the club's visitors centre without speaking to Ozil.

"We would have liked to have spoken to Mesut, but we have to accept that at the moment he doesn't want to have this conversation with us," said Bierhoff. Ozil's agent Erkut Sogut, who Bierhoff had reportedly contacted before the visit, declined to comment on the reason for the rejection. At the start of the month, Loew said he has often already tried to contact Ozil, but without success.

After 92 appearances, 23 goals and 40 assists for Germany, Ozil retired from international duty in July, citing 'disrespect and racism' within the German Football Association (DFB), taking direct aim at President Reinhard

Grindel.

"In the eyes of Grindel and his supporters, I am German when we win, but I am an immigrant when we lose," the 2014 World Cup winner, who was born in Germany to Turkish parents, wrote in a statement.

Having been the target of xenophobic comments on social media and singled out for blame in the wake of Germany's woeful World Cup display, Ozil, 29, received little public support from Loew or Germany's stars. Loew only responded publically to Ozil's claims at the end of August when he rejected any notion of racism within the national team. AFP

#### FIFA denies Amnesty International claims about unpaid World Cup workers

CAPE TOWN - Dozens of migrants working on Qatar's \$45 billion World Cup final city of Lusail have gone unpaid for months, Amnesty International said yesterday, the latest rights accusation against the 2022 tournament host.

Mercury MENA, a contractor, "failed to pay its workers thousands of dollars in wages and work benefits, leaving them stranded and penniless" in the country, according to the London-based rights group. FIFA yesterday accused Amnesty of being 'misleading' and said the non-payments were not connected to the 2022 tournament.

"We have no reason to believe the reported violations of workers' rights are in fact linked to FIFA and the 2022 World Cup," a FIFA spokesman told AFP. "We regret Amnesty chose to frame its statement in such a misleading manner."

Anesty said at least 78 employees from Nepal, India and the Philippines had not been paid since February 2016 and were owed an average of \$2 000 (1 700 euros) -- for some the equivalent of several months' wages

In some cases this h a d "ruined

lives", said Amnesty, which urged the Doha government to pay the workers, some of whom took out huge loans to secure a job in the super-wealthy

Gulf state. One worker, Ernesto, a piping foreman from the Philippines, told Amnesty he was in greater debt after working in Qatar for two years than before he arrived in the country. Other labourers from Nepal

said they had to take their children out of school or sell land to cover debts incurred by working in Qatar.

Amnesty claimed Mercury MENA "took advantage" of Qatar's "kafala" system, which prevents workers from changing jobs or leaving the country without the permission of bosses. Unpaid workers eventually allowed to leave Qatar only did so at their own cost, said Amnesty.

As well as helping build Lusail city, which is also the venue for the 2022 football tournament's opening match, Mercury MENA helped build a showcase stadium that was an integral part of Qatar's winning presentation to FIFA in December

2010. In November, Amnesty said the company's chief executive had acknowledged "cashflow prob-**MENA** lems". Mercury has not commented on the latest report.

Qatar's labour ministry vesterday said Mercury MENA no longer operated in the country and legal action and an investigation were under way. "The concerns highlighted by Amnesty International are

> Qatar," the ministry said in a state-The findings come at a time when

## Isco leaves hospital after appendicitis surgery

MADRID - Real Madrid playmaker Isco has left hospital after successfully undergoing an operation to treat appendicitis, the European champions said yesterday.

"Our player Isco has been discharged from hospital. He will start his recovery process now under the supervision of the Real Madrid medical services," said a statement from the club which did not state how long Isco was expected to be out for. Reports in the Spanish media, however, said that the Spain international will be unable to play for around a month and is targeting a return in time for Real's crunch match away to arch-rivals Barcelona on October 28 in La Liga. Isco, who was taken to hospital on Tuesday after arriving at training complaining of stomach pains, will

miss a total of six games for Real, including last night 's testing league trip to Sevilla and Saturday's city derby against Atletico Madrid. He will also have to sit out the UEFA Champions League games against CSKA Moscow and Viktoria Plzen, as well as Spain's friendly against Wales and their Uefa Nations League game with England.

## Lampard's Derby knock Man Utd out of League Cup

**LONDON - Derby County manager** Frank Lampard piled more misery on his former Chelsea boss Jose Mourinho as the Rams beat 10-man Manchester United 8-7 on penalties in the League Cup on Tuesday.

Mourinho paid the price for making nine changes in a thrilling 2-2 draw at Old Trafford before spot-kicks with Paul Pogba rested on another day dominated by the Frenchman's frosty relationship with his manager.

Phil Jones finally missed from the spot after 15 successful penalties in a highquality shootout.

"The penalties come, somebody has to miss. I knew we were going to be in trouble with Jones," said Mourinho in a barb at one of his own players. Mourinho also confirmed Pogba has been stripped of the United vice-captaincy after criticising the Portuguese's tactics in a 1-1 draw at home to Wolves on Saturday.

"The only truth is I made the decision

of Paul not to be the second captain anymore," added Mourinho.

Early on it seemed like the United boss would get a positive response from his much-changed side as one of Lampard's former Chelsea team-mates Juan Mata slotted home the opener after just three minutes at the end of a fine team move.

However, an unchanged Derby side struck back after the break thanks to a wonderful free-kick from on-loan Liverpool striker Harry Wilson.

Moments later, United goalkeeper Sergio Romero saw red for handling another Wilson effort outside the area.

The visitors made the man advantage count when Jack Mariott headed home five minutes from time, but Marouane Fellaini looked to have saved Mourinho's blushes with a towering header deep into stoppage time. However, substitute United 'keeper Lee Grant failed to stop any of Derby's penalties and Jones finally faltered to compound a bad start to the season for Mourinho's men, who already trail Premier League leaders Liverpool by eight points.



# The FA 'agrees terms to sell Wembley'

LONDON - The Football Association has reportedly agreed terms to sell Wembley to Shahid Khan as English football's governing body prepares to vote on the future of the national stadium.

As exclusively revealed by Sportsmail in April, Khan, the billionaire owner of Fulham and the NFL's Jacksonville Jaguars, tabled a formal offer for the home of English football.

He made the FA an £800million offer - more than £500m in cash, as well as allowing the FA to keep the Club Wembley debenture and hospitality business that is valued at a further £300m.

The 10-man FA board will discuss whether to approve the sale on Thursday, however the two sides have already agreed an outline deal, say the Financial Times. This does not mean the sale has been confirmed however, with FA chief executive Martin Glenn and chairman Greg Clarke seeking unanimous approval for the sale to go through.

According to reports, the FA have driven a hard bargain to ensure the future of the national stadium as a top sporting venue is ensured.

This includes an agreement that the FA have the right to buy back Wembley for just £100m if it is stripped of elite status by UEFA.

#### Experience, stability bolster Germany's Euro 2024 bid

BERLIN - With a long history of hosting major sporting events, Germany makes a solid case for hosting the Euro 2024 finals, with the winning bid to be announced today.

#### Big events, big stage

Germany has an impressive track record of hosting top sports events.

Usain Bolt broke both the 100m and 200m world records at Berlin's Olympic Stadium when the capital hosted the 2009 world athletics championships and Germany's hosting of the 2006 World Cup football was a

Other recent events successfully hosted include the 2011 women's World Cup, 2017 women's handball world cup and last month's European athletics championships, which Germany's bid has highlighted.

"All political and football structures are in place in Germany, with a long and stable history of successful organisation," noted UEFA's evaluation report.

#### Modern stadiums, infrastructure

"We are a football nation and our fans always want to show their passion for football," boasted ex-Germany captain Philipp Lahm, who heads the Germany bid.

The 10 cities each have state-of-the-art stadiums, boasting a total capacity for the 51 matches in Germany of 2 780 000, compared with 2 290 000 for the Turkey bid.

While two of the seven stadiums in the Turkey bid need rebuilding or renovating, there are no such concerns in Germany.

#### Strong attendance

With an average of more than 40 000 fans per Bundesliga match, Germany has the highest attendance figures in Europe's top leagues. Germany 2006 yielded the second highest average attendance figure in World Cup history of 52 491 - second only to USA 1994 where each game was watched by 68 991 on average.

#### **Euros for Euro 2024**

For sponsors and UEFA, a tournament in Germany would be financially more profitable than in Turkey.

The 10 German stadiums could in principle accommodate 2.78 million spectators, 290 000 more than in Turkey, earning more from ticket sales.

"For the development of football and UEFA, it is very important to make as much money as possible with the tournament, to then distribute the money between all the European federations," said UEFA President Aleksander Ceferin. AFP

SHU....Shu....Shukuma Eswatini! Greetings and welcome to another edition of your favourite column, Shukuma Eswatini.

Summer is upon us and there is no better way to welcome this time of the season than to vigorously train our bodies.

It is a fact that a majority of people are 'allergic' to winter, meaning they do not exercise their bodies during this time of the season. Now that summer is almost here, everyone should find time and ensure that their bodies get adequate training.

By adequate, of course depending on each individual's physical state, 45 minutes of training at least four times a week should do the trick.

The past few months were somewhat hectic in the country, especially with the elections taking centre stage. As a result, we neglected to commemorate the disabled in our community.

That is why next week, the SNSRC will revisit schools such as a Ekwetsembeni and St Josephs to encourage the public not to look at one's disability but rather one's ability. Our visit will be focused on sport activities as disability sports is one of our main programmes.

This programme is a repertoire of activities designed for people living with a disability.

Worth noting is that our disability sport programme seeks to create opportunities that will increase the participation and involvement of people living with a disability in sport and physical activity.

A brief background on disability sport.

A few years ago, the World Health Organisation (WHO) estimated that 650 million people lived with disabilities of various types.

Of course the number has been increasing since then due to the rise of chronic diseases, injuries, car crashes, falls, violence and other causes such as ageing. Of this total 80 percent live in low income countries; most are poor and have limited or no access to basic services including rehabilitation facilities.

The rising incidence of disability, particularly in developing countries has the potential to place further burdens on governments and health care systems. Sport can be a low cost and effective wayto foster positive health and well being, social inclusion and community building for people with disabilities.

The three largest international competitions like Deafympics, Paralympics and Special Olympics Games participation by developing countries has seen the greatest improvement since 1990. Anyone may experience disability at some point in his/her lifetime.

Disability is a normal part of the human experience and people with disabilities are part of all sectors of the community; men, women and children; indigenous and nonindigenous; employers and employees; stu-

dents and teachers; consumers and citizens.

There are numerous definitions of disability and the debate surrounding

have evolved over time.

The World Health Organisation states that disability (resulting from an impairment) is a restriction or lack of ability to perform an activity in the manner or within the range consid-

appropriate definitions of disability

ered normal for a human being.

The United Nations defines persons with disabilities (PWD) as persons who have long-term physical, mental, intellectual or sensory impairments, which in interaction with various barriers may hinder their full and

effective participation in society on an equal basis with others.

Disability sport is a term that refers to sport designed for, or specifically practised by people with disabilities. People with disabilities are also referred to as athletes with disabilities.

The SNSRC has been running a Disability Sport Programme since 2002.

The climax of the programme should be the Annual National Sports Day for people with disabilities. This day is meant to sensitize Eswatini

about disability sport and how they can contribute in developing it.

We at the SNSRC subscribe to the 'Sports-For-All, Sports-For-Life ideology, which is inclusive of the disabled community.

For a long time, the disabled community have been left out in a lot of developmental programmes.

During the National Sports Day for people with disabilities all the institutions that are involved with the disabled community work together with Council for the successful hosting of the event, which also works as a strategy to encourage membership to do the same at association level.

Lack of special equipment and specialised sports infrastructure is one obstacle that has been a challenge for Council in running this event.





This earned him the gold medal, making him the first Japanese male sprinter to win a medal in the event.

At the 2016 Summer Olympics, Iizuka won a silver medal in the 4 × 100 metres relay. He has won a total of eight medals (three gold, four silver, one bronze) in international athletics competitions.

already left Malawi en-route 0 Eswatini to seal a deal with t h e Kappa ITY 19 STRENGT Boys. He is



The Motshane-based side beat Manzini Sundowns to the services of the coach as he was officially introduced to Vovovo players yesterday afternoon at training.


