

KING CALLS FOR SECURITY COUNCIL SEATS AND PEACE

NEW YORK – The Kingdom of Eswatini has called for the allocation of not less than two permanent seats for the Africa continent on the UN Security Council.

Speaking at the 73rd United General Assembly, His Majesty King Mswati III said these seats should come with all the prerogatives and privileges of permanent membership - including the right of veto and five non-permanent seats, in the United Nations Security Council.

The king said as negotiations of reforms of the United Nations Security Council progress, the Kingdom of Eswatini calls for favourable consideration of the common African position and also for those countries that are not members of the security council. His Majesty said it was

unfortunate that the African continent continued to absorb more peacekeeping missions than any other United Nations regional grouping.

"This qualifies Africa proper representation in areas of peace and security, making it a key player as and when matters of peace and security are discussed in all structures of the United Nations. We therefore plead that Africa should not be left behind. Her voice must be heard and featured prominently and permanently at the United Nations," he said

The King' speech placed great emphasis on peace, emphasising the need for UN member countries to reassess their approaches to peace building.

"It is a time to assess whether we are still living up to the ethos of our forefathers, that sought to ensure the world never again gets to endure another world war, but rather finds peaceful solutions to resolving possible conflict.

"We are all aware of the existing pockets of tensions in different regions of the world which require that UN member states speak in one voice when providing possible peaceful solutions. A fragmented approach would render peaceful solutions elusive for the affected countries," he said.

He also highlighted that the African continent remained challenged with various diseases such as Ebola, HIV and AIDS, malaria, TB, and many others that require large sums of funding to overcome.

"Africa has taken a resolution to eliminate these diseases within a short space of time. However, without funding this will remain a challenge."

New development strategy for Eswatini

NEW YORK – In order to promote implementation of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGS), the kingdom will soon be launching a revised development strategy.

This was disclosed by His Majesty the King at the United Nations General Assembly on Wednesday afternoon.

He said the country was confident that the sustainable development goals (SDGS) and Agenda 2063 of the African Union would provide-proper guidance in this regard.

He said this would also provide the impetus necessary to eradicate poverty and create inclusive and sustainable development for all.

Review

"We have finalised the review of the National Development Strategy (NDS) 1997-2022 and will soon be launching a revised national strategy," he said.

The king said the strategy was themed: "The Development Strategy for Eswatini – Promoting Sustainable Development and Inclusive Growth."

Middle income status a setback

NEW YORK – The classification of Eswatini as a middle income country is roving to be a setback for the development of the country.

His Majesty the King, called upon the United Nations General Assembly to ensure that no country is left behind in pursuit of UN sustainable development goals (SDGS).

He brought to the fore the unfavourable impact of being categorised as middle-income country on accessing external resources which comes at a time when more resources are needed to inject innovations into development programmes around SDGS.

"We sincerely hope that the commendable reform efforts of the secretary general will help support and reinforce our efforts in accessing external resources and securing sustainable funding mechanisms, that will assist us advance towards realisation of the SDGS by 2030," he submitted.

His Majesty meets Bill Gates

NEW YORK – Hope continues to grow in the drive to end malaria as global big guns continue to lend their support.

One of these is Bill Gates who, through the Melinda- Bill Gates Foundation, has reportedly pumped in over \$2 billion worth of grants towards efforts to combat malaria to date.

The Chairperson of the African Leaders Malaria Alliance (ALMA) His Majesty King Mswati III met billionaire Bill Gates, among others, in New York on Wednesday evening to share ideas on how best to fight the malaria scourge.

This was during a dinner hosted by the Malaria Council as part of the Roll Back Malaria initiative that is also supported by the Gates foundation. Also present at the private dinner were former President of Tanzania Jakaya Kikwete and former president of Liberia Ellen Johnson Sirleaf. Kikwete was the first Chairperson of ALMA.

The king used the dinner to call for increased support towards the malaria elimination drive. He said the fight against malaria was becoming more complex and called upon everyone to join forces to ensure adequate resource mobilisation. This, he noted, would require both increased commitments from our national governments, but also from our private sector.

"Let me take this opportunity to emphasise that all forms of resource initiatives will be welcome. We need more scientists and researchers to inform our efforts in this fight, as there are new developments every other day," he told the gathering which was closed to the media. His Majesty applauded the commitment by countries towards malaria elimination saying zero malaria was possible if they all stood together to achieve it. He noted several challenges that needed to be overcome.

Climate change and insecticide resistance are among these which have compelled countries, such as the kingdom of Eswatini, to strengthen indoor resid-

ual spraying malaria interventions and doubling the number of spray operators

Pioneer

"We humbly reach out to all African heads of state to pioneer domestic financing and accountability via transparent leadership platforms such as ALMA towards this initiative," he said.

The king informed the gathering of the kingdom's initiative to create a malaria fund in order to generate resources from the private sector since government could not fight malaria alone.

The king reported on the establishment of a malaria fund in the kingdom, which has been gazetted by government and provided with up to E5 millionto support its start-up.

"As the chair of ALMA, I plan to document and share the experiences of the malaria fund, and encourage other ALMA members to take similar steps to mobilise resources from their own private sector partners," he said.

He further informed the gathering that across Africa, there are now 37 country owned malaria control and elimi-

nation scorecards, using real time data to track progress towards malaria elimination.

These scorecards, complimented by the regional ALMA scorecards, track progress, identify areas of underperformance, including the availability of funding, and identify actions to address these bottlenecks.

"We encourage every country to create a clear accountability and action mechanism, which is important and necessary across the region for ensuring efficient and effective malaria control," he said. He gave assurance that Alma would continue to support countries in the strengthening of this accountability approach, with a strong emphasis on the need for enhanced domestic resources to finally win the fight against malaria.

He commended international partners for their continued support.

"The war against malaria is not yet over, we need to collaborate our efforts stand together for a global approach as a unified community, country, subregion and continent to eliminate malaria, as zero malaria starts with me".

Country's name change applauded

NEW YORK - Applause met the news of former Swaziland reverting to her original name.

This was when His Majesty informed the United Nations General Assembly that the kingdom celebrated 50 years of independence early this year.

"We were grateful that the coun-

try has been able to champion her development agenda as a free nation for 50 years.

During this celebration the nation decided to revert to our original name, which is Eswatini.

Since time immemorial the name for the kingdom has always been Eswatini," he said to an applause.

Eswatini stays with Taiwan

NEW YORK – Any doubts about the kingdom's stance towards her support for Taiwan, were cast aside on Wednesday.

With the Kingdom of Eswatini the last African country with bilateral relations with the Republic of China, Taiwan, His Majesty the King told the world why the country deserves to partake and contribute to the United Nations development system.

"Taiwan's experience in the various fields, vital to the dimensions of sustainable development, would go a long way in contributing to the work and membership of the United Nations. "It is a strong call that the people of Taiwan are not left behind in making the united nations relevant to all people to be in line with the spirit of universality," he emphasised

THE MELINDA-BILL GATES MALARIA ELEMINATION STRATEGY

MALARIA is a top priority of the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Our new multi-year Malaria strategy, Accelerate to Zero, adopted in late 2013, addresses the areas in which we believe the foundation is best positioned, among a broad spectrum of partners, to develop groundbreaking approaches to reducing the burden of malaria and accelerating progress toward eradication of the disease. Our Malaria strategy is based on a core set of foundational principles that support our evolving strategic choices. ■ Malaria eradication is defined as removing the parasites that cause human malaria from the human population. Simply interrupting transmission is not sufficient to achieve eradication. ■ Eradication can be accelerated by new drug regimens and strategies that lead to complete parasitologic cure of the individual. Current artemisinin-based regimens achieve only clinical cure of the individual and do not eliminate the forms of the parasites that are responsible for continued transmission.

■ The majority of malaria infections occur in asymptomatic people, who are a

source of continued transmission. A successful and accelerated eradication effort will target asymptomatic infections through community-based efforts.

Emerging resistance to current drugs and insecticides is an immediate threat to recent gains and an obstacle to future progress. Use of current tools and development of new tools should be guided by this evolutionary imperative.

Malaria is biologically and ecologically different throughout the world. Malaria eradication will depend on strategies developed and implemented on a local or regional level.

We concentrate our resources in areas where we can identify significant leverage points, and we assume risks that are more challenging for others to take. The push is part of the Gates Foundation's global plan to eradicate malaria from the Earth "within a generation." Now the foundation is putting \$4.1 million towards a new approach: dispatching a lab-engineered force of maleonly mosquitoes built to essentially murder their own offspring. 

WILL THE SECURITY FORCES INVIGILATE EXAMINATIONS?

Mbabane

WILL the security forces invigilate the external examinations?

This question begs an answer after reports started circulating that government had lined up the security forces to invigilate the examinations in the event that teachers carry out the threat to snub the responsibility.

The country's security forces comprise the Royal Eswatini Police (REPS), Eswatini Umbutfo Defence Force and His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) members.

In a communiqué that is making rounds in social media circles, SNAT revealed government's contingency plan to ensure that the exams are written and the country's security forces will be roped in.

This comes after government successfully stopped a strike by the teachers' body SNAT through a court order.

SNAT members are demanding that government give in to their 6.5 per cent Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA) demand and they are threatening to snub, amongst other things, the invigilating responsibility.

The communiqué says that the Examination Council of Swaziland (ECOS) through the Registrar Dr Edmund

Mazibuko has raised security concerns for the papers and the regional education offices will house the exam papers.

"Inspectors, officers from the armed personnel, final year students from colleges and universities will be invigilating. The rented cars for the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) will be used to ferry the paper per day and collection will be done after the paper has been written, there will be two armed officers per school.

Plight

This is how our government is hell-bent in not addressing our plight and we need to put in place our plan C since our plan B is intact," reads the post.

When contacted on the allegations, His Majesty Correctional Services Commissioner General Isaiah Mzuthini Ntshangase said teaching was not their mandate.

He said correctional officers were trained to watch and guard prisoners not to carry out teachers' responsibilities.

"We all have to stick to our mandates and whatever issues we have should not affect the innocent children's future," he said. He further clarified that he was not against the teachers' strike but the court made it clear that the strike should be deferre

He said Eswatini citizens should not make it a norm to defy court orders.

Ntshangase said under no circumstances would correctional officers attend to classes and do responsibilities of a teacher because they were never trained for that.

Mandate

Meanwhile, Police Chief Information and Communications Officer, Superintendent Phindile Vilakati said their mandate is to maintain peace and order.

She added that they are not aware of the statement and that the ministry in line with education should be tackling the matter.

"Our mandate is not to teach but maintain peace and order and to protect lives and property," Vilakati said.

Members of the EUDF requested a questionnaire on the issue but openly declared that responses would only be available immediately.

When reached for comment on the matter, the Ministry of Education and Training Principal Secretary Sibongile Mtshali said she was in a meeting.

A text message was forwarded to her but there was no response at the time of compiling this report.

Striking teachers face no-work-no-pay pinch

TEACHERS who abscond class during working hours run the risk of having the notorious no-workno-pay rule imposed on them.

Also, they face other disciplinary measures from their employer.

This is the view of Attorney General Sifiso Khumalo.

His comments come at the wake of a decision by the teachers to abscond classes on certain days of the week to attend to what they have aptly described as 'vusela' exercises. Just yesterday, some teachers went to deliver a petition to the Embassy of the United States of America in Ezulwini leaving pupils stranded in most schools.

The AG clearly stated that it is the employer's decision to effect a disciplinary action against employees who abscond themselves during working hours.

"In as far as I know, the teachers strike was stopped by the court, so in the event the teachers continue with the strike then it is contempt of court," he said.

The teachers strike, organised by their union, the Swaziland National Teachers Association of Teachers (SNAT) was expected to commence Monday. It was stopped by the Industrial Court on Sunday.

The strike though lawful was deferred to November 23, 2018 to give the new government a chance to deal with the demands of SNAT. It was further mentioned that should it become necessary for SNAT to commerce the strike action, they shall give the new government new dates after November 23.

Teachers aim to force government to offer them a reasonable Cost of Living Adjustment as opposed to the zero per cent offer.

Principals send SOS to ministry

PRINCIPALS say they are waiting for the ministry to send a directive on what happens next following that some teachers absconded classes.

Some teachers snub classes on certain days of the week to attend to what they have aptly described as 'vusela' exercises. President of the Eswatini Principals Association (EPA) Welcome Mhlanga said they were waiting for the ministry of education and training to issue a directive on what should happen now that some teachers do not report for work.

He said pupils were present at school but teachers were absent.

"If the ministry doesn't intervene, the situation will continue like this," he said further stating that they (principals) were only administrators thus

they cannot tell teachers what to do.

He said principals cannot take care
of all the classes when the teachers
are absent. He therefore stated that
the current situation needs the ministry's intervention. The acting Prime
Minister Vincent Mhlanga said teachers are expected to report to work
without fail.

SNAT members assault Observer photojournalist, grab camera

The delivery of the petition at the US Embassy was spoilt by the thoughtless behaviour of some teachers who resorted to assaulting Swazi Observer photojournalist Mduduzi Mngomezulu whose camera was also confiscated.

Mngomezulu still has no idea why the teachers lost their minds in the middle of an exercise, where they are seeking help from a foreign mission. The helpless photojournalist was manhandled and assaulted by the teachers outside of the embassy while trying to capture pictures. He was assaulted with open hands and fists and he sustained injuries on the face and body.

Members of the executive and some of the teachers came to his rescue and they escorted him outside of the enclosed area which houses the Swaziland Water and Services Corporation (SWSC) where he was able to repossess the camera that was stripped from him by one of the teachers

Mngomezulu has already opened a case with the police. The newspaper will be taking the matter up firstly with the US Embassy where it will enquire if it encour-

aged assisting hooligans as a known supporter of press freedom.

"It is difficult to believe teachers did this." SNAT has a huge task of weeding out all the ruffians from the organisation if it is to be taken serious by any international organisation like the US Embassy. Again, this incident should help flag other organisations including the US Embassy to consider extending any help to organisations that harbour criminals and gangsters. The newspaper will take the matter up with the Editors Forum, MISA and

SNAT executive itself," said the editor. He lamented that SNAT allowed its members to behave in a manner that threatened any sympathy.

"We hope the US Embassy will react in a manner that is going to confirm it as advocates of press freedom. And I also hope it will review any form of assistance it was to extend to SNAT until they are convinced the matter is resolved. Parents should also be worried about their children if teachers behave like rascals," he added.

ONLY EXTERNAL CLASSES HAD ACADEMIC ACTIVITY

ONLY external classes had lessons flowing without interruptions in most schools around Mbabane.

Other classes did not have much academic activity since some teachers were absent attending to what they have aptly described as 'vusela' exercises. Yesterday, teachers marched to the US embassy to deliver a petition.

When this publication visited the schools around the Mbabane city they found Grade Seven's, Form Three's and Five's in class doing their revisions for the coming examinations.

Form Five pupils in the country will from next Monday sit for their final examinations.

Pupils

Other than the external classes pupils were either found in class making noise or outside.

The schools that were visited include St Mark's Primary and High Schools, MDS Primary, St Francis Primary and Ka-Boyce High Schools,

At Ka-Boyce High School it was a different story, pupils were found in their respective classes doing their daily activities

with their teachers.

INTRODUCTION

The SBC Limited Financial services retail group ("the Group", "SBC") continues on its path to remain relevant to its constituents and clientele through its products and financial solutions.

These currently fall within the retail sector in the Kingdoms of Eswatini and Lesotho trading under the "Select" and "Lesana" brands respectively. These financial solutions have an inclination towards incremental housing loans that are suited to the affordability of the client. The additional loan products suite includes education and consumer goods and are provided with a view to improving the livelihood of our client base and their families.

Organic growth and continuous improvement in the Group remains a key focus area. Coupled with this is the need to provide a platform to enable ownership of affordable quality housing to a wider sector of the market. Malkerns Square represents the Group's initial step towards fulfilling this social need and incorporates first world living standards to meet the demands of a modern homeowner. The development will also incorporate a compressed component of a modern homeowner. The development will also incorporate a commercial component. This will include retail outlets to benefit the residents and the Malkerns community at large obviating the need for them to travel to address their basic lifestyle requirements.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

SBC increased its level of disbursements to E158m (2017 - E135m) for the period under review due to an accelerated growth in Lesotho on the back of opportunities afforded by the mobile loan management system, the securing of addition funding and sales infrastructure expansion. This has been facilitated by a relatively stable political environment and along with that, a consistent collection performance.

The result was that the gross loan book grew at an annualised rate of 17% during the period to E899m compared to 16% growth in the equivalent period in the prior year. Disbursements (net of rollovers) in Eswatini amounted to E96m (2017 – E105m), a 9% decline on the equivalent period in the prior year and this is an indication of a relatively constrained economic environment with there being no civil servant pay increases in the last year. These increases typically impact on the affordability of Group's customer base and with that their

The impact of the continued loan book growth achieved by the Group on revenue continues to be offset by a slightly lower yield which has reduced to a blended rate of 29.3% in the period under review (2017 – 31.8%). While the increase in relative contribution of the Lesana business will cause yield to appreciate, we have seen a decline in yield in the Eswatinian intervals. business which is attributed to pricing changes in anticipation of regulation, introduced and anticipated. This has been exacerbated by the discontinuance of certain high yield product offerings which now fall outside the Group's risk appetite.

In spite of a 15% increase in the average gross loan book value over the prior equivalent period and a 6% increase in revenue, in an inflationary economic environment, the operating expense increase has been contained to 2% through tight cost control and exploiting the benefits of a mobile loan management system which avoids the need for the business to invest in advance in 'bricks and mortar' to drive growth. Within operating expenses is bad debt provision and write off expenditure amounting to E8.0m (2017 – 7.5m) to recognize an increase in the level of distressed clients in the loan population. Provisions ended the period at 4.1%, are now IFRS9 compliant and fractionately up on the prior period equivalent of 4.0%. Accordingly operating profit is up by 9% over the prior period comparative

Other income at E25m is up by 39% over the prior year comparative and is attributed to an increase in interest bearing loans to related parties as well as low average cash balances in the 2017 period and prime overdraft lending rate increases which benchmark the rate at which these loans earn interest.

Finance costs at E67m (2017 - 52ml increased by 30% over the prior period comparative and predominately arose from interest on notes issued under the listed medium term note program and other promissory hotes issued by subsidiary Select Limited. Average borrowings increased by 21% and the average rate increased by 0.8% to 12.0% over the prior period in an escalating borrowing cost environment.

Profit before tax declined by 9.1% to E28m (2017 - E31m). An adjustment to a prior year estimate amounting to E1m lifted the effective tax rate up to 31.9%

The overall result is that earning per share declined from 22 cents in the comparative period and from 43 cents for the full prior year to 20 cents in the period under review

The Group has continued its expansion drive, with new outlets in both the Select and Lesana jurisdictions. In the case of ESwatini, the Siteki branch expands the footprint and distribution to counter competitive activity and improves our value proposition and convenience to our clients. The Group has also recently expanded its footprint and distribution capabilities in Lesotho at the Maseru branch as well as new satellite offices in Mafeteng, Hlotse and Cacha's Nek allowing our offerings to be presented in these areas on a consistent basis, as opposed to the select days previously offered. This sales infrastructure expansion has increased market penetration and visibility for the Lesana brand.

The call-centre is strategically important in the activation of both in-bound and out-bound sales as well as providing support for collections through periodic campaigns

The loan management system (ILS) with its mobile capability continue to facilitate increased sales through improved distribution channels available to the Group, where the Group's product offering can now delivered to remote sales sites. The ILS system's capabilities include segmentation which enables the correct suiting and flexibility of products that are focused solutions for our client base's needs.

Further to this, capability continues to be developed throughout the group by securing the correct skillset to ensure optimal delivery. Continued improvement remains a mantra of the business as it copes with the changing demands of the business and the industry at large.

PROSPECTS

The trading environment continues to see increased competitive pressure where competitors are upselling to our client base influencing our sales performance. Management needs to continually review the Group's offerings to ensure that they remain both relevant and competitive. The Malkerns Square development will provide new and alternate avenues to attract clientele and fresh revenue streams

The Group continues to be encouraged by the prospects that Malkerns Square brings, despite the lag effect occasioned by the need for conformity to the regulatory requirements. Progress at Malkerns Square has seen the construction of 54 residential rental units, which management expects to complete shortly and to become available to the market. The Sectional Titles Act, which the Minister for Housing and Urban Development launched recently, brought to life the ability to own a sectional title registered property. The Select franchise is positioning itself to provide financial solutions to qualifying clients for the purchase and ultimate ownership of a part of an aspirational lifestyle housing estate of which

Funding activities continue to support this growth strategy along with the Group's internally generated cash flows. Opportunities in the markets we operate continue to be explored to ensure sufficient funding is available to support the Groups strategic drive.



Army truck rams into a house, vehicle at Khuphuka

MEMBERS of a homestead at Khuphuka near Hlane narrowly cheated death when a runaway army truck rammed into their family house and a vehicle which was parked nearhy

The accident which left the house which is valued at over E50 000 extensively damaged, happened on Wednesday afternoon. According to sources, the truck was being driven by a uniformed member of the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) who was also in the company of a colleague.

In the meantime, a motor vehicle which belongs to the National Malaria Programme which was parked next to the house was also not spared as it was crushed by the truck. An eyewitness who wanted to be identified only as Mgazi said the vehicle appeared to have

lost its brakes as it approached the homestead at high speed.

Upon entering the homestead premises, the driver is said to have managed to avoid crashing into the first house, but only to end up crashing into the main house. Other witnesses who spoke on condition of anonymity said the driver of the truck appeared to be intoxicated. "Apparently the driver's state of sobriety was questionable as he appeared to have difficulty in maintaining his balance. It also remains a mystery on how he lost control of the vehicle on such a clear and level ground," said a source.

Meanwhile, UEDF Public Relations Officer Lieutenant Nkosinathi Dlamini confirmed the incident. However, Dlamini said details on how the accident actually happened were still scarce at the moment. "I have just received a report with regards to the incident, and we will hopefully have full details from the police who are investigating it," he

122 000 Emaswati need food aid

ABOUT 122 000 people in the country need food

This is according to the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO) in its September, 2018 crop prospects and food situation quarterly report.

In response to the government's call for support after the El Nino-induced drought reduced crop production by two thirds in 2017, FAO, with financial support of over E29 million (E29 619 555) from the Canadian, USA government and FAO, funds supported farmers with inputs.

In partnership with the ministry of agriculture, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA), World Food Programme (WFP) and NGOs, FAO registered over 8 000 farming households for the E-Voucher system after which they received smart cards to redeem inputs at the nearest agro-dealer.

FAO also trained the farmers on climate-smart

agriculture techniques to maximise production despite erratic weather patterns.

"About 122 000 people in Eswatini, mainly located in east and south of the country, where unfavourable weather resulted in localised production shortfalls, need food aid.

Forms

Eswatini forms part of the 39 countries globally, which require food assistance. While the report cites persisting conflicts in some countries as the dominant factor driving the high level of severe food insecurity in the world, for Eswatini, climate related shocks, mainly adversely impacted food availability and access," the report reads as part.

The 122 000 people in need of food aid are based in the Lowveld where it is not conducive to grow maize because of inadequate rainfall.

The FAO is working closely with government in coming up with long-term strategies that would ensure that farmers in dry areas either convert completely to livestock farming or their access water is improved so that the country could achieve universal food security as part of Vision 2022 and Agenda 2030.

Eswatini's cereal production increased despite climate change impact

WHILE Southern Africa saw a decline in cereal outputs in 2018, Eswatini recorded an increase in production.

This is the observation of the Food and Agriculture Organisation of the United Nations (FAO) in its September, 2018 Crop Prospects and Food Situation quarterly report.

Experienced

According to the report, Eswatini experienced an overall five per cent increase in cereal production (largely maize) in 2018 from the previous season. As a result of the increase in production, Eswatini together with Namibia, saw a slight decline in maize prices while other countries experienced increases.

"The decrease in South Africa's maize output accounts for the bulk of the sub regional (SADC) contraction, where the harvest is estimated at 13.8 million tonnes, 3.8 million tonnes lower than the record high of 2017," reads the report.

FAO said this year's production decline mainly reflects firstly: below-average rains and above average temperatures in January and early February, which generally correspond to the flowering and cob formation stage of maize. At these stages, maize is most sensitive to water deficits. Secondly, outbreaks of fall armyworm had localised negative impacts, however, the precise extent of the damage has not been quantified.

Although Eswatini was also affected by climaterelated impacts, like other countries in the FAO subregion, but the country was able to produce a bumper harvest from many parts of the country except the usual Lowveld.

Newly developed tourism website attracts over 20 000 visitors

This was the case for Manzini Municipality story yesterday as the municipality was given thumbs up for the unity and dedication it has displayed in the year 2017/18.

Vocal residents such as Inalda Antonio George commended the municipality for the spirit of unity. Stakeholders said unlike other municipalities such as Mbabane where there has been a lot of infighting Manzini has fared well.

Stakeholders said this was a great initiative considering that some families tend to hide some of their family members suffering from autism.

Not all was rosy for Manzini Municipality as stakeholders also pointed out that there are areas where they must put more effort. Stakeholders said the municipality must address the issue of pot holes in roads leading to Manzini bus rank and also address the issue of overgrowth in the some parts of the town. Making his remarks when presenting the 2017/2018 annual report, Manzini Mayor Mxolisi Mabuza said as council they have a new five-year vision which emphasised on two key words; innovation and creation of economic opportunities for the city.

KISSING, FONDLING A TEENAGER LANDS MAN BEHIND BARS

A 50-year-old man of KaLanga on Wednesday appeared at the Siteki magistrate's court after he was arrested for allegedly kissing and further touching a teenager's private parts.

*Richard (real name withheld to protect the identity of the complainant) was charged with contravening section 5(1) of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act 15 of 2018. The accused was alleged to have wrongfully and unlawfully committed a sexual violation against a teenage girl who is also related to him. He allegedly kissed the

complainant and further touched her private parts without her consent. When the accused person was informed of his rights to legal representation, he elected to conduct his own defence while appearing before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula.

He was however not asked to plead to the

charge. In the meantime, the accused person filed an application for bail which was subsequently granted at E1 000. Meanwhile in the same court, Jabulani Gumede of Mndobandoba faced a charge of rape. He was said to have wrongfully and unlawfully had sexual intercourse with a woman without her consent.

The charge was accompanied with aggravating factors which included that the accused inflicted a lifetime trauma to the complainant by forcing her to the act. The Crown which was represented by Prosecutor Thobile Motsa filed an application for a date of trial which was accordingly set for September 28. The accused person was remanded into custody pending commencement of the trial





SODV Act put to the test as accused gets paltry E1 000 bail

COULD there be some loopholes which may have been overlooked in the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence (SODV) Act before it was passed?

This was the question which some legal experts and law enforcers were left asking themselves after an accused person who was charged with contravening the Act was granted a paltry E1 000.

Relatives of the complainant (aged 13 years) were left in near tears as they watched the accused person walking free after paying his bail

This was in the case of Nicholus Mtsamo Maziya (61) who was charged with contravening section 3(1)(a) as read with sub section 9(b) of the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act 15 of 2018.

According to the charge sheet, the accused

is said to have wrongfully and unlawfully had sexual intercourse with the 13-year-old. The charge was accompanied with aggravating factors which include that the accused inflicted a lifetime trauma to the complainant by forcing her to the act.

He is also said to have exposed the victim to the risk of contracting sexually transmitted illnesses. The accused person's first appearance before court was last Friday where he was accordingly remanded into custody.

He was back in court yesterday after acquiring the services of an attorney.

The matter was before Principal Magistrate Dumisani Magagula. The defence Lawyer Mzobanzi Dlamini filed an application for bail on behalf of the accused person. In his arguments, Dlamini pointed out that the Act was silent on the issue of bail as it did not state whether or not the Magistrate's Court has jurisdiction to hear bail applications. Moreover, Dlamini pointed out that the Act also did not state the minimum amount of

bail. In this case, Dlamini said the Supreme Law (which is the constitution) comes into place when there are such ambiguities in an Act or its clause.

He therefore pleaded with the court to grant bail at a reasonable amount, adding that the accused person was an elderly who is also a citizen of the country. After listening to the arguments, the court granted bail at E1 000. Worth mentioning is that under the Common Law (where the accused person would be charged with rape), the magistrate's court had no jurisdiction to hear a bail application.

Following Maziya's case, some legal practitioners pointed out a number of loopholes in the SODV Act. One such loophole resulted to an accused person paying a meagre E1 000 for bail.

Furthermore, the legal practitioners noted that the penalty clause of the Act does not clearly states the minimum penalty when one is found guilty.

Application for Extension of Time Filing of Income Tax Returns

In terms of Section 33(1) of the Income Tax Order of 1975, as Amended, the Commissioner General of the Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA), hereby advises all taxpayers who intend to apply for extension of time for the submission of returns as follows;

i. Applications for extension of time are now open for consideration by the SRA.

ii. In taking into account that the submission dates have been staggered, only compelling cases will be considered.

Application Process

Applicants are expected to do the following:

i. Complete the extension of time form in full; this is obtainable from SRA Website under forms.

ii. Attach the necessary supporting documents as stated in the application

iii. submit such forms to the SRA on time.

· Taxpayers are hereby informed that the extension of time shall not exceed sixty (60) days. For taxpayers whose financial year-end is June 30, the extended period shall not exceed 31 December 2018.

· Taxpayers who have been authorised by the Commissioner General to use a different financial year end may receive an extension for a period of up to sixty (60) days after their deadline for submission of their Income Tax Returns.

The following requirements must be fulfilled by the taxpayer when applying for extension of time

i. Application must be made and signed by the taxpayer's public officer and not by accountants or auditors of the taxpayer.

ii. All applications must be submitted 30 days before the end of each filing period as notified by the Commissioner General as follows:

those with 31 October deadline; application should be submitted on or before 1 October 2018

those with 30 November deadline; application should be submitted on or before 1 November 2018

those with 31 December deadline; application should be submitted on or before 1 December 2018.

Convincing reasons causing the delay in submitting the actual tax return are evidently advanced to the Commissioner General.

iv. The taxpayer must be compliant in all tax types for a period of 3 years successively.

v. Interim financial statements must be attached.

vi. The taxable income declared in the interim financials should have been increased by at least 10% from preceding year's taxable income. vii. In the case of a loss, the taxable income declared in the interim financials should at least be 5% of the previous year's turnover.

Revision of Estimated Assessments to the Actual Return Assessment

Taxpayers are hereby reminded that the interim returns and financials are not final but are in anticipation of actual filing on or before the expiration of the granted extension of time period.

For the final actual return to be considered for revision, the following con-

i. Income so declared in the Interim Return of Income should not have ditions should be met: been less than 90% of the actual taxable income submitted in the final

return. However, where the estimated income is less than 90% sufficient reasons must be given for such shortfall.

ii. Tax due resulting from the assessment of the interim tax returns should be paid in full notwithstanding the fact that the actual tax due is less than the estimate.

Further Note the following:

No applications will be processed after this deadline has elapsed.

 Failure to adhere to the above guidelines shall result in penalties being imposed in accordance with section 40 of the order.

· The timeous submission of an application for extension of time should not be construed to suggest extension has been granted. Written response granting/declining extension will be issued by the SRA to applicants.



'INTERROGATE VIOLENCE DURING ELECTIONS'

THE Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration (CHRPA) is concerned with the violence witnessed during the recently-concluded national

CHRPA Commissioner Sabelo Masuku said the commission was concerned with sporadic violent acts which were observed in some polling stations. Some of these events were observed in Manzini North and Ndzingeni Constituencies, where there were efforts to temper with the election process.

The commission also noted that during the nomination exercise, acts of violence were also spotted in some communities, particularly those that were characterised by chieftaincy disputes. Masuku urged the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) to work on interrogating the causes of the violence and take necessary action in order to maintain peace and order during such an important national assignment.

Masuku also mentioned that the commission noted that there was a need to count votes right at the polling stations, where voting at took place. This, according

to Masuku, would encourage transparency, credibility and the ease of acceptance of results. "The commission encourages the EBC to conduct counting within polling centres to avoid transportation of ballot boxes to counting centres. The process was marred with delays, which could have been avoided, much to the frustration of the electorate and candidates," Masuku said. The commission further urged the EBC to hasten the development of standardised guidelines for special voting. This included the incorporation of ballot papers from the special voting to the mainstream votes.

The commission also noted that there was a need for better guidance on campaigning code of conduct. There could be a need to strengthen the education, given that the campaign messages, expectations from the elecatorate still depicted a lack of understanding of the roles, especially those of legislators.

The commission congratulated the EBC for ensuring adherence to the country's electoral laws during the election exercise. The commission also congratulated the people who managed to win the elections to become MPs.

The commission hoped that the newlyelected MPs would do their best in driving the country's policies and legislations to transform the lives of Emaswati for the

Masuku challenged the new MPs to ensure they rise to the challenge. He reminded them of the economic situation faced by the country and urged the new lawmakers to ensure they pulled their weight in driving the country in turning the economic situation around. Masuku also applauded all institutions that had been available to observe the whole election process as they were able to work together with the local human rights commission.

Commission concerned on election of women

THE Commission on Human Rights and Public Administration (CHRPA) is concerned about the small number of women that were elected during the recentlyconcluded national elections.

Out of the 503 candidates that were eiected eitner as ivirs, indivuna, or bucopho, only 60 of those are women. This means that the women account for only 12 per cent of the winners of the elections. CHRPA Commissioner Sabelo Masuku said there was a need for the country to engage itself in a vigorous education exercise on the importance of electing women.

Leadership

The election of women into Parliament and leadership positions still remains a challenge. This, Masuku said, posed a challenge to the country's attainment of the African Union's (AU) aspirations towards Agenda 2063 and the United Nation Agenda 2030 (SDGs) on gender equality and empowerment of women. "There is a need to better understand the deep social and economic issues that have a bearing on the election of women into these positions. Unless these fundamental root causes are well understood and taken into consideration and dealt with, we will have a long way in achieving

the targets set out," Masuku said. The commission further congratulated MPs-elect Lady Howard Mabuza and Thandi Nxumalo from Mafutseni and Manzini South, respectively.

The commission described the people of Mafutseni and Manzini South as those that have put the country in a good light in its endeavour to achieve gender parity in decision making, as obliged in the SADC protocols and other international instruments.

"We also commend all of the eight (eight) constituencies that have elected women as Tindvuna teTinkhundla. This is a great step towards the right direction and we hope they will be supported in the execution of their very important functions," Masuku said.





GERARD SEKOTO: APARTHEID ERA TASTES ARE STILL BORNE OUT AT ART AUCTIO

WHEN two recently discovered paintings by revered South African artist Gerard Sekoto (1913-1993) -Portrait of a Man (Lentswana) and Three School Girls - went on auction at Bonhams London early in September 2018, there was some anticipation about what kind of prices they would

When the hammer fell they garnered just over £380 000 and £300 000 respectively.

In pound sterling terms it was way off the record set for Sekoto's Yellow Doors, District Six, which sold at the same auction house for just over £600 000 in March 2011. But in South African rand terms and using exchange rates at the time of the purchases - the sales look rosier at R7,45-million and R6 million, compared to 2011's R6,8-million for Yellow Doors.

While the fluctuating and often volatile exchange rate creates a certain amount of confusion about how to read and understand Sekoto's work relative to the different markets in which it sells, his work consistently (and significantly so, given his pedigree in South African art history) under-performs in relation to the likes of compatriot Irma Stern (1894-1966).

At the same Bonham's sale in March 2011 that saw Yellow Doors, District Six sell for a record sterling price, so too did Stern's Arab Priest sell for a touch over £3-million (R34,3-million at the time). Stern holds eight of the 10 auction records for South African art.

One does not want to undermine the extent to which Stern bucks the international precedent in which auction records are dominated by male artists. But in many ways her prominence in the South African art market represents the resilience of apartheid era tastes and preferences, which at the time largely overlooked the quality of concurrent black artists. And through the public performance of the auction, this same preference is visibly borne out every time the hammer falls.

Contemporary offers

So, what is it that's keeping the likes of Sekoto's work off the boil? There are at least six factors to con-

ing) preference for the contemporary over the historical. In 2017 the Barloworld corporation sold off most of its historical collection at auction to fund a new focus on contemporary art, particularly photography. Most of the offloaded works were by white artists. Nonetheless the auction reflects a view that the historical is compromised and too difficult to associate with. For many corporates the contemporary offers a slate that is more alive, easier to inhabit, and hipper. Sadly, in this view (dare I say prejudice), black artists like Sekoto get whitewashed and swept



out the door along with all the other historical artists.

Second is the alienating environment of the art world itself. While events such as the Joburg Art Fair has gone out if its way to present a programme that isn't as narrowly white as in the past, there are few opportunities to purchase historical artworks. And if it's not a privately brokered deal, the best opportunity to purchase a Sekoto is at auction. All the South African auction houses that attract quality works by Sekoto are white owned, run and patronised. If you're not white it's hardly a welcoming environment in which to enjoy spending millions on art.

their sales, particularly those that take place in London. Bonhams started its South Africa sales in 2006. Country-specific auctions are not uncommon, but for a country like South Africa, whose art history is a relative mystery compared to North America and Europe, it can leave it a little isolated.

When isolated like this it's more difficult for collectors wanting to build a meaningful collection to find affinities and connections with artists from elsewhere in the world. It remains to be seen whether Sotheby's London, in choosing to start a modern and contemporary

African art sale in 2017, will find better traction for the likes of Sekoto in a wider African context.

Fourth is the lack of wider and sustained government support for artists whose works should more meaningfully constitute national heritage.

The South African Heritage Resource Agency does flex its muscles by refusing export permits for artworks that are deemed to have cultural and heritage significance. But this is a double-edged sword. While artworks remain in South Africa it also restricts buyers to a local pool.

The Department of Arts and Culture, under then minister Brigitte Mabandla, was instrumental in First is the greater (and increas- Third is how art auctions frame brokering the return of Sekoto's estate from France where he died in exile in 1993. It also managed to have the crippling French death taxes waived.

But the South African government has since reneged on most opportunities to cement Sekoto's legacy. Fifth is the lack of sustained momentum around research on Sekoto's oeuvre. First introduced to Sekoto by academic Chabani Manganyi, historian Barbara Lindop's "Gerard Sekoto" (1988) remains the definitive catalogue raisonné of the artist's work. Along with the publication of Manganyi's "A Black Man Called Sekoto" in 1996,

it seemed we were set for a bibliography of scholarly work on Sekoto. But this was not to be.

The absence on new works on Sekoto stands in stark contrast to the richness of scholarly works on Irma Stern, and importantly, by a wide range of scholars.

And finally, there's the role of families and foundations in continuing artistic legacies. The Gerard Sekoto Foundation was set up at the insistence of the French government as a precondition for them wavering the death taxes.

It is an organisation that survives largely on the passion and generosity of its founder member, Lindop.

Without any evident support from Sekoto's family, Lindop is a lone crusader against the Sekoto fakes, copies and stolen works that so often undermine an artist's prices. It's unrelenting work, and without the prospect of handing over her vast visual knowledge to a new generation of champion.

The Sekoto Foundation is currently under the umbrella of the Norval Foundation. But its own museum seems more invested in the alumnus of white art history such as Edoardo Villa and Cecil Skotnes. Whether this relationship is sustainable in the long term remains to be seen.

WHY DEPRESSION PILLS COULD BE FUELLING THE RISE OF SUPERBUGS

ANTIDEPRESSANTS could be contributing to the rise in superbugs. Research suggests that an ingredient in the commonly prescribed antidepressant fluoxetine — or Prozac — causes a mutation in some bacteria, making them resistant to antibiotics.

Antibiotic resistance is one of the biggest threats to our health, according to the World Health Organisation. It occurs when the genes in bacteria change in order to resist the effects of antibiotics.

If these drugs fail, common infections such as pneumonia and salmonella are difficult — in some cases impossible — to treat.

Antibiotic resistance already causes at least 50 000 deaths a year in Europe and the US, and some studies suggest this could rise more than tenfold by 2050.

Measures to combat the superbug crisis have focused on reducing over-prescription of antibiotics, because the more antibiotics are used, the greater the chance that bacteria will develop ways to survive them - and these robust bacteria go on to proliferate.

Research in the BMJ earlier this year found that a fifth of antibiotics prescribed by GPs in England are given to patients who don't need them.

However, the new study, published in the journal Environment International, suggests other drugs could also play a part.

The research looked at whether the antidepressant fluoxetine had any effect on the E. coli bacterium, which causes food poisoning.

Fluoxetine was chosen as it passes through the body unchanged before entering the environment via urine. Up to 11 per cent of fluoxetine is thought to get into the environment - where high lev An ingredient in fluoxetine could causes a mutation in some forms of bacteria

els are thought to induce multidrug resistance. In the study, E. coli was exposed to four concentrations of fluoxetine — 0.5, 5.0, 50 and 100mg/I — for 30 days in the laboratory.

Results showed that, when exposed to 5mg/l or more, the bacterium underwent genetic changes that made it resistant to antibiotics such as chloramphenicol, amoxicillin and tetracycline, often used to treat acne as well as respiratory and urinary tract infections.

Fluoxetine

The greater the fluoxetine dose E. coli was exposed to, the higher the rate of antibiotic resistance.

According to the researchers, from the University of Queensland in Australia, fluoxetine causes an overproduction of free radicals (unstable atoms that damage cells and DNA) in the E. coli.

This led to mutations in the bacterium's efflux pumps - these push toxins, including antibiotics, out of the cell. The altered pumps removed the antibiotics so rapidly that they had no chance to get to work.

'This is a common mechanism for antibiotic resistance which we have known about for 30 years,' says Peter Hawkey, a Professor of clinical and public health bacteriology at the University of Birmingham. But scientists are unsure of the implications of this laboratory study.

One argument is that concentrations of the drug used in the study were much higher than those found in the real world: once in the body, the concentration of the typical 20mg adult daily fluoxetine dose is about 20 times lower than the smallest dose that caused antibiotic resistance in the study (5mg/l). So it's unclear whether this dose in humans would trigger bacterial mutation.

And although fluoxetine prescriptions have risen (by 50 per cent between 2005 and 2015, to 6.6 million a year in England) and the drug is found in the water supply, concentration levels in the environment are 'significantly lower' than those used in the study, says Professor Hawkey.

"There is a huge amount we don't know about antibiotic resistance and the idea that non-antibiotic prescription drugs may cause [it] is interesting," adds Dr Andrew Edwards, a Lecturer in molecular bacteriology at Imperial College London. "Laboratory studies like this are useful to understand how the process might work.

"However, this study used high concentrations of fluoxetine, so it is difficult to know whether this link would persist outside the laboratory. Patients should not change or stop taking their medication based on these results."

But antidepressants are not the first chemicals - other than antibiotics themselves - to be linked to superbugs. A study last year in the Journal of Antimicrobial Chemotherapy found the common disinfectant triclosan may also contribute. It showed E. coli exposed to triclosan could become resistant to quinolones, antibiotics used to treat urinary and lower respiratory tract infections.

"To limit the number of drugs in the environment, no medication and particularly no antibiotics should be flushed down the loo," says Professor Hawkey. "Take unwanted medicines to a pharmacy for safe disposal."

Children pick up marijuana at younger age if their mothers use the drug certain aspects of brain develop-

WHEN mom uses marijuana, children are more likely to try the drug at a younger age, a new study shows.

When mothers used cannabis during the first 12 years of a child's life, there was a 40 per cent higher likelihood the child would start using the drug earlier than peers whose moms weren't using, researchers reported in the American Journal of Preventive Medicine.

On average, children whose mothers used marijuana tried it themselves an average of two years earlier than peers whose mothers didn't use the drug.

That puts those children at risk for a host of marijuana-linked problems, said lead study author Natasha Sokol, who was a doctoral student at the Harvard TH

Chan School of Public Health when the research was done.

Children with mothers who used marijuana were at increased risk of starting to use the drug themselves before age 17. Their peers were more likely to start at 18.

The time between 16 and 18 'is a critical period of development, said Sokol, who is now at the Centre for Alcohol and Addiction Studies at the Brown University School of Public Health.

"Marijuana might be disrupting

ment, including the development of the endocannabinoid system. It's been associated with depression and, in predisposed individuals, there seems to be an increased risk of the development of psychosis." Marijuana use at this age can

also affect a child's ability learn, Sokol said.

"Missing school or functioning at a lower level in school is a big deal," she said. "Especially if it's for an extended period of time."

Sokol and colleagues analysed data from participants in the National Longitudinal Survey of Youth and their biological children who signed on for the NLSY Child and Young Adults survey.

Nedbank headline earnings increase to E52.2 million

NEDBANK'S headline earnings increased by three per cent to E52.2 million in the past financial year.

In 2017, the bank attained an income of E50.9 million,interim financial statements released yesterday show.

Deposits made to the bank also increased by five per cent to E3.9 billion. In 2017, deposits stood at E3.7 billion.

Nedbank attributed the growth in deposits to increases in wholesale banking, Loans and advances, however, regressed by six per cent to E3.2 billion. In 2017, loans and advances contributed E3. 5 billion to the bank's revenue.

"The continued effects of the country's fiscal challenges, and external environment effects especially in South Africa, have also had an impact on the economy," the report states.

The bank's capital and reserves declined to E721.6 million as compared to E733.2 million as at June 30, providing a capital adequacy ratio of 25.4 per cent, which is far

higher than the statutory requirement of eight per cent.

Ezulwini municipality records over E6 million surplus

EZULWINI Town Council's revenue rose to E6.9 million in the past year, marking a 15 per cent increase.

This was revealed by the council Chairperson Bongiwe Mbingo.

Mbingo was speaking during a residents and stakeholders breakfast meeting that was held at Royal Villas yesterday.

"The surplus for the year stood at E6 971 526, this was an increase of 15 per cent from E6 045 850 when compared to the 2016/17 financial year," she said.

Mbingo said Ezulwini Town Council's financial position this year improved from E89 million to E99 million.

The town has been involved in different projects that have rehabilitated it.

According to Mbingo the municipality has invested a lot in infrastructural development.

"Property plant and equipment has increased from E60 million to

E65 million which is equivalent to eight per cent. The contributing factor was the upgrade of the Kunene and Lubane roads and the Mantenga

phase two roads," she said. The total project cost for Kunene and Lubane Roads was E3.6 million, whilst the Mantenga phase two road contract cost

was E3 669 239.81. "Non-Current liabilities decreased by 52 per cent from E8 550 094 to E4 510 161 since the loan of E8m which was acquired in March 2014 from Old Mutual will be paid up in February 2019.

The monthly instalment amount is E198 666 83. Current Liabilities increased by four per cent. From E5 555 748 to E5 781 101 when compared to the 2016/17 Financial year. Revenue for the year increased by nine per cent from E17 470 766 to E19 087 443 when compared to the 2016/17 financial year.


Process

This, in turn, will provide a substantial return of capital to Old Mutual shareholders while supporting the efficient allocation of capital by Old Mutual through the retention of a minority stake in Nedbank.

MTN tells Nigerian staff to stay at home due to strike

JOHANNESBURG - South Africa's telecoms group MTN yesterday told its staff in Nigeria to stay at home after the country's main unions launched a nationwide strike to demand a higher minimum wage from the government.

Talks between the Nigerian Labour Congress (NLC) and the government to avert the strike broke down on Wednesday. Unions want the government to almost triple the monthly minimum wage to around 50 000 naira (\$164) from 18,000 naira.

President Muhammadu Buhari's government had vowed to review the minimum wage, particularly in the wake



of a fuel price hike and currency deval-

uation in the last two years both aimed at countering the effects of a plunge in global oil prices, Nigeria's economic mainstay.

Meanwhile, it was announced yesterday that Nigeria's Central Bank Governor Godwin Emefiele was optimistic the bank would resolve a dispute linked to allegations that South African telecom firm MTN moved funds out of the country illegally.

The bank month ordered MTN and its banks to bring \$8.134 billion back into the country that MTN allegedly had sent abroad in breach of foreign exchange regulations.




PRETORIA - SA's new mining charter will require holders of mining rights to raise the level of black ownership to at least 30 percent from 26 percent within five vears, Resources Minister Gwede Mantashe said yesterday.

The charter is part of an affirmative action drive that aims to reverse decades of black exclusion from the mainstream economy.

Agreeing a new version of the charter is crucial to securing further investment in the mining industry in the world's top platinum producer and bolstering President Cyril Ramaphosa's pledge to revitalise the economy.

The third version of the charter, which sets out required levels on black ownership and other targets for mining companies, has been delayed for years amid wrangling with the industry in decline.

Mantashe, speaking to journalists, said least 20 per cent of the 30 per cent stake of black ownership would be in the hands of businesspeople with the other 10 per cent being

The 30 per cent target was widely expected as it had been in drafts of the third charter but investors and the industry were waiting for the final breakdown.

Household debt level to income ratio rises

JOHANNESBURG - Data released by the South African Reserve Bank (Sarb) in its quarterly review showed that the household debt level to disposable income ratio rose slightly to 71.3 per cent in the second quarter from 70.9 per cent in the first quarter as disposable income fell faster than household consumption expenditure.

The good news from a personal finance point of view was that the money spent on financing the debt was steady at 9 per cent of disposable income, in part thanks to the 25 basis points cut in the repo rate to 6.5 per cent announced by the Sarb in March.

The bad news is that the average overdraft rate charged by commercial banks only dropped by 19 basis points between March and July,

which is the latest available data. Since the Sarb's first cut by 25 basis points in July 2017, the average overdraft rate has only been reduced by 29 basis points, so banks have passed on only 5 per cent of the 50 basis points cut since July

Expenditure

Real final household consumption expenditure contracted by 1 per cent on a quarter-on-quarter seasonally adjusted annualised basis in the second quarter after a 0.9 per cent rise in the first quarter, while disposable income fell by 1.3 per cent in the second quarter following a 1 per cent rise in the first quarter. In 2017, consumption rose by 2.2 per cent, while income jumped by 2.8 per cent, and in 2016 spending increased by 0.7 per cent, com-

pared with a 1.9 per cent gain in disposable income. This meant that the personal saving rate became positive in 2017 for the first time since 2005 at 0.3 per cent. This thrift ethic continued into the second quarter, with the savings ratio rising to 0.4 per cent from 0.3 per cent.

The Sarb said household spending was also suppressed by diminishing wealth effects in the first eight months of 2018, as the FTSE/JSE All Share Index trended gradually lower amid heightened volatility driven by increased risk aversion towards emerging market economies, together with weak domestic economic activity and policy uncertainty, particularly regarding land expropriation without compensation.

A recovery in household spend-

ing and income is expected in the third quarter due to a round of aboveinflation wage increases that became effective from July.

According to Andrew Levy Employment Publications, the average wage settlement rate in collective bargaining agreements was 7.3 per cent in the first half of 2018, compared with 7.8 per cent in the same period in 2017.

The better employment and wage prospects in the third quarter are to a certain extent already reflected in the instalment sale credit and leasing finance data.

This credit category is predominantly used to finance purchases of new and used vehicles by the household sector and this category increased by R5.3billion in the second quarter of 2018, compared with a R4.1billion gain in the first quarter. Personal Finance




'MBEKI WENT OVERBOARD BY CRITICISING JACOB ZUMA'

JOHANNESBURG - The ANC in KwaZulu-Natal has accused former president Thabo Mbeki of going overboard by criticising his successor, Jacob Zuma, for calling "black people" to unite to obtain a two-thirds majority in Parliament to amend the Constitution to allow for land expropriation without compensation.

Briefing the media in Durban on Wednesday, ANC Provincial Secretary Mdumiseni Ntuli said after reading Mbeki's 30-page paper on the land question, he felt that "the former president of the ANC went overboard in terms of how he characterised the former president of the ANC".

"I have read the article purported to have been written by him [Thabo Mbeki], very critical about the ANC position on the land question. And to some extent as I was reading I felt that the former president of the ANC went overboard in terms of how he characterised the former president of the ANC," said Ntuli.

"Now what we are taught in the movement by engaging others is that the leadership of the ANC should avoid the temptation to cast aspersions on those who

led before you. When I read that reflection on the land question, radical economic transformation, the trajectory of our country, I felt that Thabo Mbeki was not only doing what he should have done, which is to intervene intellectually to analyse our reality and produce some suggestions.

"But he was also somehow directly questioning the understanding of the former president and his predecessor of the ANC and the trajectory the ANC has been pursuing over the past 106 years in terms of the national question."

Ntuli said he did not think that Mbeki's weighing in on the sensitive land question should have been done the way it was, let alone finding its way into the public domain.

'I was not appointed to protect anyone'

JOHANNESBURG - Former national director of public prosecutions (NDPP) Shaun Abrahams has responded to revelations that Bosasa CEO Gavin Watson planned to lobby former president Jacob Zuma over the appointment of a National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) boss.

Abrahams denied ever discussing the Bosasa matter with Zuma and explained he put his prosecutors under intense pressure to finalise the matter.

He further denied that he was appointed to protect any NPA official

News24 on Wednesday revealed the contents of a secret recording of a meeting between Bosasa CEO Gavin Watson, former Bosasa chief operations officer Angelo Agrizzi and former correctional services commissioner Linda Mti on May 8, 2015.

Watson is captured on the recording discussing his plans to speak with Zuma about the appointment of an NDPP and how Bosasa was a victim of an elaborate plot by the

media and anti-ANC elements to discredit them.

He refers to a planned meeting with Zuma after the former president returned from Russia. Zuma was in Russia on May 8 and 9, 2015.

Zuma appointed Abrahams as NDPP in June 2015.

The Special Investigations Unit (SIU) found in 2009 that Bosasa, now named African Global Operations, allegedly paid bribes to Mti and correctional services chief financial officer Patrick Gillingham in exchange for tenders worth more than R1.5bn, from catering to fencing, at prisons around the country.

This report was handed to the NPA in 2010 and a Hawks investigation was launched around the same time. To date, no charges have been brought.

Abrahams and the NPA, in an official response to questions, have laid the blame for the nearly decadelong delay on the Hawks and their failure to ensure the finalisation of a forensic report.

'Cyril Ramaphosa must come clean at state capture inquiry'

PRESIDENT Cyril Ramaphosa should "come clean and account" by testifying at the Zondo commission of inquiry into state capture, as he was part of government dealing with stateowned enterprises.

Democratic Alliance leader Mmusi Maimane yesterday reiterated the party's call for Ramaphosa to take the stand at the commission currently sitting in Parktown, Johannesburg.

"When Ramaphosa was the

chair of the inter-ministerial committee on state-owned enterprises, he would have known the boards [of the companies]. He would have exercised the ANC deployment committee. Now to suddenly wash themselves clean as if this was Jacob Zuma, and the ANC has nothing to do with it, is misleading the people of South Africa. "If we want to eradicate state capture, let's deal with the ANC. Let them come here [and give evidence]. If we need to appear ourselves, I will come and give evidence."

Maimane accused the ANC of being at the heart of state capture and making the act its own policy.

Grade 8 pupil stabbed to death outside Northern Cape school

KIMBERLEY - A Grade Eight pupil at Richmond High School in the Northern Cape has been stabbed to death, allegedly by another pupil at the school, while attending catch-up classes.

Northern Cape Department of Education spokesperson, Geoffrey van der Merwe, said on Wednesday that the department was shocked and saddened by the tragic event, which happened on Monday outside the Richmond High School premises

He confirmed that the incident involved two Grade Eight pupils, both of whom were 15 years old.

"The one pupil stabbed his fellow classmate with a knife and the boy died on the scene."

According to Van der Merwe, the school had arranged a special class for the Grade Eight pupils to give them an opportunity to complete their technology assignments.

"They were supposed to report for the class at 11am but some of the pupils in

the grade, including these two boys, arrived about an hour late. As a result, the teachers were busy inside with the assignment and did not witness the fight that broke out. By the time they realised what was happening, it was already too late. The boy died on the scene in the arms of the teacher."

According to Van der Merwe, the other boy had been issued with a suspension letter and appeared in court on Tuesday and the case was postponed to next week. *Diamond Fields Advertiser*

Toilet topples over, trapping woman inside

CAPE TOWN - A concrete public toilet in a Cape Town informal settlement fell over while a resident was using it.

"I screamed for dear life," said Vuyiswa Nofuma. The resident of Taiwan informal settlement was trapped in a toilet when the concrete structure toppled over on Monday morning with her inside.

"The toilet had fallen face down leaving me trapped. Luckily, there were some neighbours sitting nearby drinking. They heard me, saw the toilet, and quickly fetched spades to dig around the toilet in order to turn the toilet to its side and get me out," she said.

Nofuma says she has been using the flush toilet, which is a few metres from her home, for five years.

"When the toilet fell I landed on my left arm, hurting my shoulder, and the toilet pot broke falling on my leg. I had



seen that it was not properly attached to the ground, but I had no idea that it was completely loose. When I was done and turned around to flush, I felt it tipping over. I tried holding on, but couldn't. I crouched, covering my face and head with my arms and hands."

Community leader Thandi Jolingana said, "Most of the toilets that we use here are unstable and are not pinned properly to the ground. We have reported this to the city of Cape Town since last year, along with toilets that leak or that are broken. But it seems that our reports go unheard because the toilets have not been fixed yet. Even cleaning them, we have to do that ourselves.

Madagascar bans presidential vote opinion poll

MADAGASCAR - Madagascar's government faced a backlash on Wednesday after it moved to have the publication of an opinion poll ahead of presidential elections cancelled, claiming it was protecting "public order". The survey, commissioned by the German Friedrich Ebert foundation, canvassed voting intentions ahead of the first round of presidential voting on November 7 and was due to be published by current affairs magazine Politika. A run-off round of polling will be held on December 19 if there is no outright winner in the first ballot. AFP

The four were arrested in late December as they were going from house to house, urging people to join a march organised by the Catholic church to demand President Joseph Kabila step down."

The Magistrates Court on Tuesday sentenced four activists from the Filimbi movement to 12 months' jail for insulting the head of state," their lawyer Jacquemain Shabani told AFP.

MELANIA TRUMP TO PROMOTE CHILD WELFARE IN GHANA, MALAWI, KENYA, EGYPT

WASHINGTON - Melania Trump plans to emphasise child welfare in Ghana, Malawi, Kenya and Egypt in October on her first extended solo international mis-

The trip will also be the first ever to the vast African continent by America's Slovenia-born first lady.

She discussed the trip on Wednesday at a reception for the spouses of foreign leaders and others participating in the annual UN General Assembly.

"October 1 will mark the first day of my solo visit to four beautiful and very different countries in Africa," Mrs Trump said during brief remarks to several dozen guests attending the event near the UN headquarters.

She said she looks forward to spreading the message of her "Be Best" child-welfare initiative. She launched the campaign in May to focus on overall child well-being, with an emphasis on opioid addiction and online behaviour. The countries on her itinerary work closely with the

US Agency for International Development, which is helping organise the trip, she said.

Bullying

"Whether it is education, drug addiction, hunger, online safety or bullying, poverty or disease, it is too often children who are hit first, and hardest, across the globe," Mrs Trump said.

"Each of us hails from a country with its own unique challenges, but I know in my heart we are united by our commitment to raising the next generation to be happy, healthy and morally responsible adults."

She offered no details on her activities in each country during the trip,

which spans the first week of October.

The first ladies of Ghana, Malawi and Kenya attended the event and Mrs Trump recognised each one individually. The first lady of Kenya accompanied President Uhuru Kenyatta to the White House in August and she and Mrs Trump met separately from their spouses.

Mark Green, Chief of the International Development Agency, said its maternal and child health programmes have helped save the lives of 4.6 million children worldwide, most of them in sub-Saharan Africa.

The agency also works on increasing young people's access to education. He said African primary school enrollment rates increased from 61 per cent to 79 per cent between 2000 and 2014. "That excites the recovering teacher in me very, very much," quipped Green, who spoke before Mrs. Trump. Green was a volunteer teacher in Kenya before he was elected to represent Wisconsin in the House and served as US ambassador to Tanzania. AP

Monk's death in Egyptian desert monastery under investigation

CAIRO - Egypt's Coptic church said Wednesday that prosecutors are investigating the death of a monk who had until recently served in a monastery northwest of Cairo where the abbot was killed in July.

In a brief statement, the Coptic Orthodox Church said the cause of monk Zeinoun al-Magari's death, at the al-Muharraq monastery in southern Egypt, remained unknown.

It said he was transferred there following the July death of Bishop Epiphanius, abbot of St. Macarious monastery. **Publicised**

That suggested Zeinoun may have been involved in a nowpublicised disciplinary dispute between Epiphanius and several monks at St. Macarious.

Epiphanius' killing has shaken Egypt's Coptic Orthodox Church, one of the oldest Christian communities in the world, and opened a window onto its cloistered world. The church introduced monasticism to the faith, but its monastic desert traditions had largely vanished before being revived over the past cen-

The July killing took on added significance because two monks one of whom was defrocked - are the main suspects. Both are on trial for the killing of the abbot.

Mnangagwa leaves out Mugabe's venom at UN

IT was a very different Zimbabwe speech at this year's UN gathering of world leaders after the fall last year of Robert Mugabe, long the source of tirades against Western

New President Emmerson Mnangagwa was a former Mugabe enforcer, but he now styles himself as a reformer and says his country looks forward to playing a role as a "responsible member of the family of nations".

Mnangagwa did briefly call on Wednesday for the immediate, unconditional removal of "continued illegal sanctions" as he badly needs foreign investment in Zimbabwe's long-collapsed economy. He himself remains a target of US sanctions for alleged rights

But while the now-ousted Mugabe could be counted on every year for an acid blast at the US and others over perceived meddling, Mnangagwa stuck to the earnest language of "peace, unity and tolerance" as he insisted Zimbabwe is "open for business".

Mozambique fails to probe rights abuses - UN

MAPUTO-The United Nations the offices of the Mozambican action was being taken to comcriticised Mozambique in a letter seen by AFP on Wednesday for failing to take action following attacks on a dozen rights activists and reporters critical of the government since 2015.

The United Nations Human Rights Commission said it was "concerned at the threats and aggression" faced by "journalists and human rights defenders" opposed to the government.

The letter, dated April 24, singled out the case of media commentator Ericino de Salema, who in March was bundled by gunmen into a vehicle outside

Union of Journalists in Maputo.

Two hours later, he was dumped on the outskirts of the city with a broken arm, fractured legs and severe bruising.

"(The attacks) appear to be related to the expression of their political opinion and criticism of the government," added the letter signed by David Kaye, the special rapporteur on freedom of expression and Michel Forst, the special rapporteur on human rights defenders.

The United Nations, through its Human Rights Commission, had given Maputo 60 days to respond to inquiries about what

bat rights abuses - but officials did not respond.

"We express concern at the broader chilling effect this has on the exercise of the right to freedom of expression in Mozambique," said the letter.

The effect on the "media, civil society organisations, human rights defenders and in general those voicing dissent" was particularly serious, it added.

In addition to De Salema's case, the UN missive warned that more than 10 other prominent individuals had been harassed. attacked or killed for their work.



'Heads of state were laughing with me, not at me'

NEW YORK - No one laughs at Donald Trump.

The president on Wednesday dismissed as 'fake news' reports that world leaders laughed at him in the opening moments of his speech to a session of the UN General Assembly.

"They weren't laughing at me. They were laughing with me," he declared at a news conference Wednesday, the day after counterparts from around the globe audibly laughed as he began the highly anticipated address by reciting U.S. economic gains under his watch.

"We had fun. That was not laughing at me," he said. "So the fake news said people laughed at President Trump. They didn't laugh at me. People had a good time with me. We were doing it together. We had a good time. They respect what I've done." Trump opened Tuesday's speech by describing the American economy as "booming like never before."

He also claimed his administration had accomplished more in less than two years than any predecessor had by this same point in their terms. *AP*

PUTIN HITMAN UNMASKED

LONDON - The smirking Salisbury hitman wanted for poisoning Sergei Skripal has been unmasked as a decorated GRU colonel who was awarded the Russian military's highest honour by Vladimir Putin after his service in Chechnya and Ukraine.

The real identity of one of the two assassins, identified by police as Ruslan Boshirov, is reportedly Colonel Anatoliy Vladimirovich Chepiga, 39. He was made a Hero of the Russian Federation by decree of the president during a secret ceremony in 2014. The disclosure, uncovered by investigative journalist organisation Bellingcat in conjunction with The Telegraph, exposes as lies Putin's claims that the Skripals' would-be killers were innocent 'civilians'.

Col Chepiga and a second GRU spy, who used the name Alexander Petrov, were charged over the March poisonings by the Crown Prosecution Service, but later appeared on Kremlinfunded news channel RT to reveal their bizarre cover story.

Calling themselves tourists, they said they were only wandering around Salisbury after failing to get to Stonehenge because of snow, and stumbled on the Skripals' house - as shown on CCTV - because they were looking for Salisbury Cathedral, which has a 400ft spire and is 25 minutes in the other direction.

The pair also refused to say why they booked into an east London hotel 127 miles away - or why it contained traces of Novichok - and failed to explain why they appeared to have no luggage when they hastily travelled home to Russia.

India's top court decriminalises adultery

NEW DELHI - India's top court yesterday ruled that adultery is no longer a crime, declaring a colonial-era law that punished the offence with jail time unconstitutional and discriminatory against women.

The more than century-old law prescribed that any man who slept with a married woman without her husband's permission had committed adultery, a crime carrying a five-year prison term.

"Thinking of adultery from a point of view of criminality is a retrograde step," unanimously declared the five-judge bench of the Supreme Court.

Liable

Women could not file a complaint under the archaic law nor be held liable for adultery themselves, making it solely the realm of men.

The court said the law deprived women of dignity and individual choice, and treated them as the property of men.

It also said that adultery, while valid grounds for divorce, was a private matter.

The court upheld the legality of the crime in 1954, arguing that in adultery "it is commonly accepted that it is the man who is the seducer, and not the women".

A petitioner had challenged the law earlier this year, describing it as discriminatory.

Trump laments #MeToo as very dangerous for powerful men

WASHINGTON - President Donald Trump on Wednesday placed himself at the centre of the anguished national debate over sexual assault, suggesting in his defence of embattled Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh that the #MeToo movement was "very dangerous" and unfairly threatened an entire class of powerful men.

Trump's expansive argument cast doubt on the credibility not only of the three women who have accused Kavanaugh of sexual assault, but also on scores of other women who have claimed sexual abuse by prominent men, including the president himself.

In his defiant rush to rescue Kavanaugh's nomination, Trump effectively sought to draw a line in the sand against the growing number of allegations that have felled male authority figures in politics, the media and business including many, Trump acknowledged, who have been his friends.

Dangerous

"When you are guilty until proven innocent, it's just not supposed to be that way," Trump told reporters. "That's a very dangerous standard for the country."

During a freewheeling, 81-minute news conference Wednesday in New York, Trump was asked whether the sexual assault or harassment brought against him by more than a dozen women - claims he denies - influenced his thinking about the Kavanaugh's accusers.

"Absolutely," Trump said.

"I've had a lot of false charges made against me, really false charges," he added.

"I know friends that have had false charges.

People want fame. They want money.

They want whatever. So when I see it, I view it differently than somebody sitting home watching television, where they say, 'Oh, Judge Kavanaugh this or that.' It's happened to me many times."

Trump appointed himself the judge's principal character for the case witness and moved to personally navigate one of the most acute crises of his presidency.

The president said he stood by Kavanaugh, but also left open the

possibility of withdrawing his nomination if he is persuaded of the judge's guilt after watching the testimony from him and his first accuser, Christine Blasey Ford.

Some of the first cracks in confidence emerged inside the White House on Wednesday as a third woman came forward alleging Kavanaugh sexually assaulted her, with growing worries that the nomination might go down.

But there was also a hardening resolve to press forward and fight back once attorney Michael Avenatti - who represents Trump accuser Stormy Daniels and is toying with a 2020 presidential run - entered the fray Wednesday representing the latest Kavanaugh accuser.

It has become a symbol of the gruesome violence rocking the country, and of the problem many experts say is driving it: the murky links between powerful drug cartels and corrupt officials. AFP

China executes man who stabbed children

CHINA - Zhao Zewei had told police he had been 'bullied' when he attended the school as a child. A man whose brutal knife attack left nine school children dead



and injured 12 others was executed in China yesterday. Zhao Zewei was sentenced to death in July for the massacre reportedly motivated by a grudge against the school in northern Shaanxi province, which he had attended as a child.

The defendant "intentionally deprived others of their lives," the court that handed down the decision said in a statement on its official social media account. *AFP*

Pope asks China for trust, courage, farsightedness

ITALY - Pope Francis on Wednesday asked the Chinese government to move ahead with "trust, courage and farsightedness" to continue a dialogue started when the Vatican and Beijing signed a landmark agreement on the appointment of bishops. In a message to Chinese Catholics, Francis also said that while they should be good citizens, they will not shrink from offering "a word of criticism" when necessary to defend human dignity. The deal, which was in the making for more than 10 years and signed last Saturday in Beijing, gives the Vatican a long-desired say in the choice of bishops in China, though critics labelled the deal a sellout to the Communist government. Reuters

Argentina gets \$57 billion

ARGENTINA - The International Monetary Fund doubled down on Argentina, expanding a record-breaking bailout for a country that has slid into recession as it struggles to stem a currency rout. Argentina's credit line will increase to about \$57bn from the \$50bn announced in June, Economy Minister Nicolas Dujovne said at a press conference with IMF chief Christine Lagarde in New York on Wednesday. MANY TO HOST EURO 202

BERLIN - UEFA have announced that 2014 FIFA World Cup winners Germany will host the European Championship in 2024, and also revealed that VAR will be implemented in the UEFA Champions League next sea-

The European giants last hosted a major tournament in 2006, when they welcomed the world to the FIFA World Cup, and last hosted the European Championship in 1988, when the Netherlands won the trophy.

Yesterday afternoon, UEFA confirmed that the German bid had beaten the Turkish bid to host the 2024 tournament.

Host

The two European nations went head to head in their bid to host the Euros in six years' time, but the majority of UEFA's Executive Committee gave their vote to Germany, as announced by UEFA president Aleksander Ceferin

Meanwhile, Euro 2020 will be the first to be held in 12 cities across 12 European countries.



In addition, UEFA also announced that the Video Assistant Referee (VAR) will be used in the 2019/20 Champions League campaign, in

the 2019 UEFA Super Cup, at Euro 2020 and in the 2020/21 edition of the Europa League.

VAR to be used from next season

SWITZERLAND - Video Assistant Referees will be used in the Champions League from the 2019-20 season and will also be introduced at the 2020 European Championship, UEFA said yesterday.

European football's governing body revealed a decision had been taken at a meeting of their executive committee to bring in the technology, which will be used from the playoff round preceding the group stage of the Champions League.

It will also be used in next year's UEFA Super Cup and in the Europa League from the 2020-21 season. In addition, it will be used in the finals of the new Nations League competition, although only from 2021. UEFA's move follows the use of VAR at the FIFA World Cup in Russia, when it was deemed largely to be a success.

"We're confident that introducing VAR in August 2019 will give us enough time to put in place a robust system and to train match officials to ensure an efficient, successful implementation of VAR in the UEFA Champions League, the world's flagship club competition,"

UEFA president Aleksander Ceferin said. UEFA were meeting at their Swiss headquarters ahead of the announcement later of the winning bid to host Euro 2024, with Germany and Turkey competing for the right to organise the tourna-

VAR has also been introduced in the top divisions in Spain and France this season, with those leagues following on from the German Bundesliga and Italian Serie A, although the English Premier League has been more cautious.

Lopetegui laments lack of urgency from Real Madrid

SPAIN - Real Madrid coach Julen Lopetegui has bemoaned the side's inability to carry out his game plan of pressing their opponents high up the pitch after they crashed to a limp 3-0 La Liga defeat at Sevilla on Wednesday.

Sevilla blitzed the European champions with Portuguese striker Andre Silva scoring twice in four first half minutes and Wissam Ben Yedder adding another as Real conceded three league goals before the break for the first time since 2003.

"We didn't play as we wanted and we paid for it in the first half, conceding two goals in quick succession. We came here with a plan of pressing them and we didn't do it as we'd have liked to, that's clear," Lopetegui told a news conference. Valverde defends Barca rotation policy

After drawing at home to Girona last Sunday. albeit with 10 men, Valverde's selection came under scrutiny, after he opted to rotate for the second time in three days.

Against Girona, it was Coutinho, Ivan Rakitic and Samuel Umtiti on the bench and just as they all had to be called upon in the second half at the Camp Nou, so were Luis Suarez and Jordi Alba as substitutes here.

"Of course the coach is responsible, a losing coach always feels responsible," Valverde said.

"But obviously it is easy now to talk about the rotations - in the end, matches are analysed on results - but you can't win the league with only eleven players."

Barcelona face Athletic Bilbao on Saturday and then Tottenham at Wembley in the Champions League four days later but one point from two of La Liga's lesser opponents is a concern.

So is the form of Pique, who was also at fault against Girona last weekend and will have to start against Spurs, with Umtiti suspended. "You have to judge the whole team, not indi-

viduals," Sergio Busquets said.

league already showing some intense competition with some teams being glaringly well prepared whilst some are still finding their feet, the Swazi Observer Sports Desk decided to


compile a write-up on the teams' directors.

These are the people whose financial muscle determines a team's activity in the transfer window, their caliber of players and the team's maintenance as a whole. Football can be very costly and as mentioned by seasoned football administrator Kenneth Makhanya, the country shining stars

Mbabane Swallows might have had to cough up about 10 million on their incredible CAF run this past season alone. Here are your MTN Premier League bosses and their info; enjoy.

1. MBABANE SWALLOWS - PRINCESS

The princess who is widow to deceased business mogul and Mbabane Swallows boss Victor 'Maradona' Gamedze is now in charge of the history-making 'Beautiful Birds' of Mbabane who



lawyer Bheki Simelane. The team has arguably been the most settled financially and the players have a clubhouse in uptown Eveni.

Gamedze who was gunned down last year owned and co-owned different companies. One such company is Swayz Marketing (Proprietary) Limited, which Gamedze co-owned with Michelo Shakantu.

They both held an equal stake of 500 shares in the company. The company's core objective entails carrying on the business of merchandise including but not limited to the distribution of cellular phones and any other gadgets related thereto.

They are also on the business of managing and enhancing the business of other companies, providing marketing strategies and advise in business development.

They also purchase, develop, sell, lease, lease to and/or in exchange or otherwise acquire lands, farms, estates, ranches, buildings, lots and any movable or immovable property and any interest therein and rights over the same within Swaziland or elsewhere.

Gamedze and Shakantu are cofounders and shareholders of Eswatini's second mobile telecommunications operator, Eswatini Mobile.

The fourth company is Serjeant Investments which Gamedze is owner and co-director with Lomkhosi Gcinile Yvonne Dlamini. Serjeant Investments is reportedly the company that owns the state-of-the-art glass house building called Madlenya Building that houses Eswatini Mobile inside the capital city's main street - Gwamile.

Under Gamedze's wing, the team has had their most successful run in

They have won the Swazi Telecom Charity Cup thrice, in the 2004/2005 season and also back to back in the 2016/2017 and 2017/2018 season.

They have also won the MTN Premier League six times. In the 2004/2005 season, the 2008/2009 season, 2011/2012, 2013/2014, 2015/2016 as well as the 2016/2017. The team has also bagged the Swazi Bank Cup thrice; in the 2005/2006 season, the 2015/2016 season as well as the 2013/14 season.

The team also has honours to the now defunct Castle Top-8, winning the 2014/2014 title and the 2016/2017 one. The 'Beautiful Birds' have also won the King's Cup, beating Soweto giants Kaizer Chiefs and Orlando Pirates on home soil.

2. MANZINI WANDERERS - SANDILE 'CHIEF' DLAMINI

The 'Weslians' director is currently up in arms with the team's supporters who are vouching for South African born-businessman Thumbela Nhlengetfwa. The maroon and white outfit have been struggling to pay player's salaries and

allowances and this has subsequently affected their results as players have even boycotted training. Since taking over the hub giantsfrom banker

Henry 'Shushu' Mthethwa, the team only has the 2005/2006 Charity Cup title to their name. The 'Weslians' spent much of their time in boardroom squabbles with the directors battling with the seemingly superior supporters committee as well as the elders structure. 'Chief' is Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Financial Services Regulatory Authority (FSRA). It still stands to be seen which structure in directorship the team will take going forward.

3. MBABANE HIGHLANDERS - ZWELI

Jele is a partner at Robinson Bertram law firm and took over the baton mid-2016/2017 season after the fans forced former boss Bheki 'Rubber'

b e i n g Commissioner General Mzuthini Nthangase. The team won the Swazi



NNAS to Host Umpires, Coaches Trainings

NETBALL - THE National Netball Association of Swaziland (NNAS) will host training courses for coaches and umpires.

NNAS Secretary Ntombikavise Masango stated yesterday that the decision to host the courses was part of resolutions taken during a meeting held last weekend.

She said they discussed, amongst other issues, their calendar which included a number of activities to be held before the national league resumes.

"We had a strategic meeting at Zakhele where it was decided that we organise a workshop to train our umpires. The course will be held at the OlympAfrica Centre at Lobamba October 6 to," she

Masango added that each team would be expected to send at least two officials to the course.

"Each team is expected to send at the least two people with a maximum of up to four. The members will have to pay a registration fee of E200 each, which covers stationery, meals and certificates. All payments are to be made to Du Pont via Mobile Money transfer or cash. I would like to stress that it is compulsory for all umpires to attend as only trained individuals

will be allowed to officiate during league games.

"Once we are done with the umpires training, a coaches one will follow a week later starting October 13 at the same venue. Teams will contribute the same amount of E200 per member and they are expected to bring not less than two," he said.

She further emphasised the importance of attending these courses stating that there would be consequences for those who shun them. "These coaches are not optional. We need coaches to have coaching certificates, especially in the Elite Division and no untrained umpire will officiate during games," she said.

Ngubane who resigned as Highlanders coach a day after a depleting big derby 3-1 defeat to Mbabane Swallows in the first game of the MTN League season to focus on his health as he is reportedly sickly said the speedy forward came to work drunk, something he could not tolerate.


"I'm a professional football coach who would not allow any football player to come to work drunk. I was doing my job and there is nothing wrong with that. Maybe other coaches would allow him to train even if he is drunk but not me," said Ngubane who is back in his native South Africa

Ngubane continued that he did not see himself coaching another team in the country other than Highlanders as he now considered himself a 'Bull' person. Asked about his current health situation, Ngubane added that he was not well. "I'm sick and had to be close to my doctor. I might look young but I'm not I'm old," Professor said.

When reached after training with his new Wanderers teammates' yesterday afternoon, 'Fash' lambasted Ngubane of trying on a couple of occasions to destroy his career.

"He must be crazy. I never came to training drunk and it will seem he is all out to destroy my career. He bad-mouthed me at Mbombela and did same when Highlanders officials took me for training after my return. Ngubane must leave me alone as I want to focus on my career and he must focus on getting a new team. I will never work with him. Even if he can come to Wanderers, I'll be the first one to exit the door," Fash said.

Fash' who had a short stint with South Africa's National First Division side Mbombela United last season completed a switch to Manzini Wanderers last week. He could make his debut tomorrow when the 'Weslians' welcome Malanti Chiefs at Mavuso Sports Centre pending his international clearance availability.

FA, GITY REAGH CONSENSUS

SOCCER – MBABANE City has finally agreed to honour their National First Division League matches sanctioned by the Premier League of Eswatini (PLE) starting this weekend.

After absconding the opening match of the MTN First Division against Tambankulu Callies two weeks ago, the team and Eswatini Football Association (EFA) have reached a consensus to honour matches while awaiting the jurisdiction of their matter from world football governing body FIFA. City strongly oppose their relegation from Premier League to the First Division, citing irregularities done by the PLE and FA in turning a blind eye to the MTN League rules and regulation of the 2016/17 season wherein there was no relegation in the elite league.

As a result, two more teams were promoted from the NFD, taking the number of Premier League clubs to

The team's Board of Governor Bongani 'Bhanyaza' Mdluli said they would honour the game this weekend. The team will travel East to play Madlenya tomorrow at the Nsukuwansuku Stadium in Mhlume.

"We will honour our weekend game after meeting with the FA where it was agreed that we must play matches while awaiting the matter to be resolved by FIFA," said City's PLE Board of Governor 'Bhanyaza' Mdluli.

Asked on the decision taken by the two parties concerning the unattended opening match against Callies, Mdluli said the team faced charges on that one but will not pronounce the PLE next step. The Mbabane based ensemble had filed an urgent

application with the High Court after receiving their NFD fixture, a matter that was dismissed by Judge Mumcy Dlamini two weeks ago. The team was praying for the court to interdict the PLE from relegating them to the NFD pending the finalisation of their complaint with the FA and or any other avenues such as lodging an appeal with FIFA or the Court of Arbitration for (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland as provided by the EFA statutes and FIFA statutes. City's High Court application was treated as of no urgency and was deferred to October 26.

Representing City in the matter was Thabiso Fakudze from Fakudze Attorneys while Zakhele Dlamini and Advocate Mduduzi 'Tsotsi' Mabila on the instruction of Desmond Manda of MLK Ndlangamandla and Associates represented the EFA and PLE, respectively.
