Gideon Mhlongo back at work

MUNICIPAL Council of Mbabane Chief Executive Officer (CEO) is back at work.

Mhlongo resumed his duties on Monday after his suspension was lifted by council. He is expected to be at the helm of the local authority until his contract expires on July 31, this year, as it had been reported previously.

Council's mouthpiece Lucky Tsabedze confirmed the return of Mhlongo to work. Tsabedze did not want to go into details about Mhlongo's contract as this matter was handled by other structures. Mhlongo was suspended by council but the suspension was lifted last Friday.

However, council will not renew his contract when it expires at the end of

Tsabedze pleaded with Mbabane residents not to be misled by people who tried to take advantage of the current situation engulfing Mhlongo. He was responding to concerns raised by Lalufadlana Development Association.

The association blamed Mhlongo for introducing policies that the association deemed to be against development initiatives towards the city. The asso-

ciation's Public Relations Officer (PRO) Ndlavela Dlamini said residents of the city had to seek permission from the municipality to construct or renovate houses. Tsabedze said people need to understand that as a local authority, they acted on behalf of government.

He said everything that was done by the council was originally from the central government, particularly from the ministry of housing.

Tsabedze further mentioned that the

policy Dlamini talked about was about 20 years old. He said the very same policy also existed in other urban areas in the country.

He urged people to verify these facts and find out the right information either from the municipality or from the housing ministry itself because that was where they would get the right information concerning the governance of local authorities like the Municipal Council of Mbabane.

The former journalist urged Mbabane residents and all those affected not to personalise issues and play to the gallery because many of the issues did not originate with Mhlongo. He said Mhlongo's situation did not mean that people should then take advantage and try to cause instability within the local authority.

BOY (17) KIDNAPPED, LOCKED IN A BEDROOM

THE country is currently going through a rough patch when it comes to children's rights violations.

A 17-year-old boy from Jericho area in Nhlangano was allegedly kidnapped by unknown people who had stopped their car to ask for directions.

The strangers later grabbed the unsuspecting Mpendulo Mabuza, bundled him into the car and sped off with him. He has been missing for two weeks now.

Sources said the kidnapped boy who apparently had a cellphone on him, called his family and claimed that his captors used a oth to cover his face and later dragged him to their car.

The brand of the car is not known. "He alleged that they drove with

him to an unknown destination. He claimed that he later found himself in an unknown one bedroom house which had a built in toilet," narrated the officer.

It is suspected that the kidnappers were not aware that he had a cell phone with him as he was able to use it.

Kidnappers

The family also alleged that Mpendulo kidnappers later on called his father and said they have him but did not express anything further. Chief Police Information and Communications Officer, Superintendent Khulani Mamba said anyone who might have information about the whereabouts of the young man can call Sihlutse Desk Officer Inspector Mfanasibili

Dlamini at 76054750.

They can also call inspector Fanyana Dlamini at 76139442.

The country is currently gripped by mysterious disappearance of people mostly children who are either found murdered or still missing. On April 30, 2018 a girl of Timphisini aged five (Nkosinaye Dlamini) was snatched at her homestead by a man who was wearing a balaclava.

After a 10-day search, her decomposed body was discovered kilometers away from where she was abducted. In a recent incident at Mafutseni area, a 16-year-old boy escaped from the jaws of death with a slit throat after three men believed to be ritual killers pounced on him in a forest on Sunday.

The boy is currently admitted to hospital. A family of Mbikwakhe area is appealing for help from members of the public after a 14-year-old girl went missing. Noxolo Dlamini was reported missing to the police by her aunt. It is said the form two pupil was last seen Wednesday last by her peers whom she told she was going home where she never arrived.

VIOLENCE ON CHILDREN WORRIES SAVE THE CHILDREN

WITH the recent hike in child rights violation in the Kingdom of Eswatini as reported in our local newspapers such as sexual abuse, kidnapping and murders associated with ritual killings, Save the Children has urged the nation to ensure children are safe and protected at all times.

Save the children, an organisation trusted to create a world in which every child attains the right to survival, protection, development and participation, stands at zero tolerance for any child violation and condones such acts.

According to the United Nations Convention Rights of the Child (UNCRC) and the African Charter on the rights and Welfare of the Child (ACRWC) that the Kingdom of Eswatini adheres to, every child has the right to life and the state parties shall ensure to the maximum extent possible the survival and development of the child.

The child's right to be protected from violence, exploitation and abuse is an obligation under international law.

Tsela said the current state of violence against children should be declared a national disaster as the country is faced daily by horrific reports of violence against children, which paints an incredibly bleak picture on the country and child rights.

Supreme Court orders Beauty Build to file papers in lawyer's case

WHILE an application filed at the Supreme Court calling upon the incarceration of lawyer Siboniso Clement Dlamini has been withdrawn, the Supreme court has ordered that Beauty Build Construction in a similar matter should properly file its papers by close of business yesterday in its matter against lawyer Muzi Simelane.

Beauty Build Construction like in the Clement Dlamini case has taken lawyer Muzi Simelane trading as MP Simelane Attorneys to Court in a similar fashion.

The National Commissioner of Police has been cited as the second respondent, while the Attorney General as the third.

The matter was before Supreme Court Judge Phesheya Dlamini who was sitting with Judges Majahenkhaba Dlamini and Stanley Maphalala.

Meanwhile, in the matter involving lawyer Siboniso Dlamini, Judge Dr Odoki who was sitting with Judges Robert Cloete and Jacobus Annandale issued an order withdrawing the application after having heard from counsel Hlomendlini Mdladla about a matter in which Dlamini allegedly embezzled widow Phindile Ndzinisa's E870 000 estate.

The Beauty Build matter's back-ground is that they filed an exparte urgent application last year seeking an order to break and enter the first respondent's premises with the assistance of the second respondent in order to execute a writ of execution.

Giving a brief background of the pre-application proceedings, the applicant stated that the High Court issued an order against the first respondent to pay the sum of E487 992.35 to the applicant.

That order was appealed against and the appeal was lost by the first respondent. After losing the appeal, the first respondent then filed a review application which was dismissed on 15 May, 2017.

A demand was then sent to the respondent to pay within thirty (30) days and the respondent did not comply with the demand and a writ was then issued against him.

The applicant's attorneys then instructed David Magagula who is a duly appointed deputy sheriff for the district of Hhohho to execute the court order against the first respondent and the Deputy Sheriff has been unable to execute the Court Order on the basis that the first respondent has denied him the opportunity to do so by locking gates to his offices.

The applicant argues that the first respondent has been in continued contempt of court as he was ordered to pay Beauty Build Construction.

STATE WANTS SIPHO'S BAIL HEARING FROZEN

THE High Court of Eswatini has no jurisdiction to set aside a judgment it handed down if there is an appeal against it at the Supreme Court.

This is an argument raised by the Director of Public Prosecutions' (DPP) office in the present urgent application filed by murder suspect Sipho Shongwe at the High Court.

Shongwe filed an application seeking an order of Court for leave to execute an order of the ruling that was made by Judge Sipho Nkosi in Shongwe's bail application as he held that the Crown failed to prove that Shongwe was fraudulently released from Barberton maximum prison.

Urgent

According to Shongwe's lawyer Sipho Mnisi of S.S Mnisi Attorneys, the basis of the urgent application is to unfreeze the bail application that is before the High Court in order for it to proceed.

He also told the court that his client suffers from ill-health and his businesses were suffering by the continued stay in custody

Shongwe stands accused of the murder of businessman and soccer administrator Victor Gamedze who was gunned down while at the Galp filling station at Ezulwini on January

Shongwe has now been in custody for five months following his arrest on January 19 a week after the assassination. According to Principal

Crown Counsel Absalom Makhanya in his heads of arguments it is common cause that the applicant (Shongwe) is charged with the offence of murder that falls under the fifth schedule of Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act (CPE) and that the applicant applied for bail before Court which was opposed by the respondent (DPP).

The High Court according to Makhanya made a ruling regarding the applicant's release from the South African Correctional Centre and that it is further common cause that the respondent filed an appeal on the question of law in the Supreme Court as it was not a trial court which should have come to the conclusion reached by the High Court in its ruling.

Submitted

Makhanya submitted that the High Court has not to date furnished the respondent with the reasons of its judgement that the crown failed to prove that Shongwe was fraudulently released from Barberton prison.

Makhanya argued that the appeal by the crown was registered by the Supreme court under case number 5 of 2018 and that once a case has been registered and allocated a case number that matter is pending before that court.

Honourable

"It is out submission that the above honourable court has no jurisdiction to set aside its judgment if there is an appeal against such a judgment before the Supreme court, it is the Supreme Court which is now seized with the matter of whether or not to set aside the appeal filed by the respondent," Makhanya submitted

He argued that it is the High Court that made the finding that the respondent failed to prove that the applicant was fraudulently released from Barberton prison hence it is not open to the same court to set aside its own finding.

Makhanya further contended that Judge Nkosi in his ruling made a finding which is final in its nature.

He said during the bail hearing in open court the judge said if he finds that Shongwe was fraudulently released from Barberton maximum that would be the end of the matter as he would not be granted bail.

The court then ruled that the crown had failed to prove that Shongwe was fraudulently released which then renders the application on extradition by South Africa pending in the court of committal with a view to surrender the applicant to South Africa.

Makhanya submitted that the cases of execution while an appeal is pending before the Supreme court relied upon by the applicant if his heads of argument are distinguishable from those before court as in the present case the appeal is not on an order of execution but on a factual finding which has a bearing on the main bail application, the committal court on extradition and the trial court in South Africa which issued a warrant of arrest against Shongwe.

Appearing alongside Principal Crown counsel Macebo Nxumalo, Makhanya submitted that in the ruling of the High Court, there was nothing to execute as argued by the applicant.

Makhanya argued that the applicant has failed to substantiate how respondent would not suffer irreparable harm in respect of the flight risk element that was alleged by the respondent in the main bail application.

Informed

Makhanya submitted that the applicant himself informed the court that the Registrar informed his attorney that the Chief Justice issued a directive to the effect that the bail application should not proceed until the appeal application at the Supreme Court is heard and has not challenged the directive thereof as it still stands.

The appeal application according to Makhanya was filed bona fide and it was to prevent the injustice that was about to occur and that the crown has prospects of success in their appeal, pleading that based on the above, the present application filed by Shongwe should be dismissed.

'High Court may set aside appeal by crown'

DEFENCE lawyer Sipho Mnisi argued on behalf of Shongwe that the High Court may set aside the appeal filed by the crown.

He said the court has powers to set aside any invalid processes.

Mnisi submitted that such can be done provided the Supreme Court has not enrolled the appeal which he argues is the case with the current appeal filed by the

"It is submitted that the appeal processes were filed by the crown, but they have been enrolled for hearing and they are currently not prosecuted, it is therefore submitted that different considerations may arise if the appeal is prosecuted as the Supreme Court would have been seized with the matter," Mnisi argued.

He submitted that the applicant's incarceration is unfair and the prolonged and ongoing imprisonment is unconscionable and that any interpretation that has the effect of barring the applicant from being granted leave to execute the order would cause hardship and grave injustice.

He also argued that the court is enjoined to interpret the applicable principles of law in such a way as to prevent such hardship and injustice.

In light of the above, he submitted that the court clearly has jurisdiction to grant the orders sought in the notice of motion.

IN his heads of arguments, Shongwe's lawyer Sipho Mnisi submitted that the non-execution of Judge Nkosi's order on his finding that he was not fraudulently released from prison should be executed as his client will suffer prej-

Mnisi argued that the applicant (Shongwe) will suffer irreparable harm if the order is not executed as his continued incarceration is denial of his right to liberty and to be presumed innocent until proven guilty arguing that the state will suffer no prejudice as the bail court will hear arguments and decide to grant or not to grant bail and will have an opportunity to advance reasons before the same court

why the applicant is not entitled to bail. Mnisi said bail should be conducted speedily and submitted that the applicant complains that the notice of appeal filed by the crown at the Supreme court together with the leave to appeal presents a rather shocking display of blatant arbi-

trariness, indecisiveness and failure to act expeditiously, consistently and fair-

Decision

also stated that the decision by the crown to appeal was motivated by mala fides as the crown notes two distinctive appeal processes against one order.

Mnisi further argued on a balance of

hardship and convenience that the applicant is in custody and his bail application has taken more that four months, he has not been found guilty of any crime, has no control of the judicial processes and that the crown has up to now failed to commit him to the High Court.

He also submitted that the applicant does not know when or whether the ruling will be written and submitted and delivered, further he is suffering from ill health and his business, financial and social issues are being affected arguing that there is no form of remedy available even if he is found not guilty and acquitted with his pre-trial detention viewed as violation of his rights.

crown submitted that the assertion made by the court during the bail hearing on not releasing and releasing applicant if the court held that he was fraudulently or legitimately released, put the matter to an end hence the appeal application they filed at the Supreme Court.

It was for that reason that Judge Fakudze felt it would be proper to go through the transcript in order to see that assertion as submitted by the crown.

By consent of both parties the matter was postponed as the transcript could not be speedily available to the court.

Matter postponed, court wants Judge Nkosi's record transcribed

THE urgent application by Shongwe's lawyer could not be finalised yesterday because Judge Mzwandile Fakudze wants the transcript of High Court Judge Sipho Nkosi.

While the arguments were being made by both counsels, the court had to adjourn to allow both parties to get hold of the transcript especially the crucial part where Judge Nkosi told Shongwe that he should forget about being released on bail if the finding would be that he was fraudulently released from Barberton maximum prison.

EX-MINISTER GIDEON'S BID TO SECURE BMW X5 FAILS

FORMER Minister for Commerce Industry and Trade Gideon Dlamini has lost his bid to secure the car he was using as minister of the crown, a top of the range BMW X5.

The High Court yesterday dismissed his application for a declaratory order that he is entitled to purchase the car after vacating office.

Dlamini who is a Member of Parliament for the Mkhiweni *Inkhundla* had argued that during his term of office, he was entitled to benefit under the Finance Circular No 2 of 2013 in particular Clause 4.5.3 in that at the end of his term he would be entitled to purchase the motor vehicle bought for official use at it's depreciated value of 20 per cent per annum.

In line with the circular No 2 of 2013, Dlamini expressed his interest to the ministry of public works and trans...In line with the circular No 2 of 2013, Dlamini expressed his interest to the ministry of public works and transport which informed him that the request had been declined on the basis that he had not actually reached the "end of term" hence he filed the application in court

port which informed him that the request had been declined on the basis that he had not actually reached the "end of term" hence he filed the application in court.

When handing down judgment yesterday morning, Judge Mzwandile Fakudze noted that the applicant (Dlamini) had stated that the circular does not define "end of term" and the lack of the definition therefore leads to the use of the Constitution.

Dlamini had contended that the first respondent's (minister of finance) decision to refuse to sell the vehicle to him was unreasonable given the kind of burden carried by a minister who can be recalled at any time during the duration of their tenure in Cabinet. The former minister further contended that where there is a reasonable belief that any policy of the executive arm will flout the express provisions of the Constitution, the court which is given the responsibility of enforcing it may call for such to be laid before the Judiciary for its scrutiny to ensure compliance.

However, the respondents submitted that in terms of Section 134 (2) and (4) of the Constitution, the life of Parliament is five years and further submitted that the term "end of term" of Parliament is five years which is the life of Parliament and any period served cannot be equated to mean the end of term or life of Parliament.

The respondents further submitted that the wording on the circular as amended is clear that the minister of

the crown can only be in a position to purchase the vehicle at the end of his term in office and since the applicant did not continue in office up to the end of the life of Parliament, he is therefore not entitled to the

purchase of the vehicle.

In light of the above and authorities cited, Judge Fakudze said he was inclined to agree with the respondents' contention that the expression "at the end term" should be interpreted to refer to life of Parliament based on the fact that Section 134 (2) provides for the life of Parliament which is a five-year period whereas Circular No 2 provides for the terms and conditions of service for Parliament that is in office noting that the two complement each other.

"The applicant's application is dismissed, and each party shall bear its own costs," Judge Fakudze ordered.

He stated that where words are clear and unambiguous, they should be given their ordinary grammatical meaning as the principles governing constitutional interpretation are the same as

those governing that of any other legislation, hence the same principle should be extended when interpreting Finance Circular No 2 of 2013 because it is a legal instrument.

Used airtime vouchers, slips can land you in hot soup

THE public is warned not to litter used airtime vouchers and slips as armed robbers and car hijackers have adopted a new framing strategy.

They take the discarded recharge airtime cards, slips or vouchers and dump them at a crime scene.

Two people from the neighbouring South Africa have already fallen into the trap and they are victims of the trick. According to reports, the two appeared in court for crimes they never committed due to the trap. The incident is said to have occurred in Ermelo recently.

Robbers or hijackers are said to be collecting used recharge cards, slips or vouchers, and once they abandon the hijacked cars or dump the dead bodies, they leave the already used cards, vouchers or slips at the scene or near the victims.

When the police arrive, they take the scratched recharge cards, vouchers or slip serial number to track the cellphone number it was loaded in; and start tracking the owner of the phone number.

Police Information and Communication Officer (PICO) Superintendent Khulani Mamba said they have come across such reports but there hasn't been a case of the same fashion in the country yet.

"It is safe for people to destroy the cards or vouchers of airtime once they make use of them before they throw them away so that they don't fall victim of the new scam. Even though we haven't had the same cases locally, we can't shy away from the possibility of it happening in the country," he said.

When quizzed on similarities in the case where slain businessman and Mbabane Swallows chairman Victor Gamedze suspected killers left receipts and a Swazi MTN SIM card in a Toyota Yaris that was dumped towards Lundzi Border Post, Mamba said there were none.

People are also encouraged to register their MTN SIM cards at the ongoing VELA SIM card registration campaign at MTN outlets, a campaign that is aimed at curbing crimes of this fashion

Thwala assured workers in the ministry of agriculture, particularly those that would be affected by the change, that there was no need to panic as the authority had not come to replace anything.

This meant no workers would be replaced or told to go home.

"No worker will be deemed redun-

dant under the new set up and no worker will be deemed worse off. Instead, the workers will be entrusted with more responsibility as they will be transferred to areas where they will be given more responsibility," Thwala said.

Support

The MP further said more responsibility for the workers meant that their pay would be improved than in the current situation. He made an example of Swaziland Revenue Authority (SRA), saying the workers at the SRA were better paid than during the time of the Income Tax Department.

He pointed out that SRA workers at the border gate had more responsibility now that SRA had taken over.

Even though during the introduction of SRA, some workers at the Income Tax Department lost their jobs.

"The difference here is that this authority has not come to replace any-

The MP also mentioned that the ministry of agriculture was making efforts to ensure that the authority was accessible to the nation. Plans to decentralise it are underway as it would be found in places like Malkerns, Ngwemphisi, and Motshane.

FPE DILEMMA AS 4 500 PUPILS HAVE NO PINS IN 40 SCHOOLS

The ministry of education and training finds itself between a rock and a hard place concerning the issue of Personal Identification Numbers (PINs) as over 4 500 pupils don't have birth certificates in 40 schools across the country.

The Free Primary Education (FPE) entails that principals submit PINs for every pupil for the schools to receive the FPE grants from government, but with a high number of pupils who don't have the PINs, the process is stalling.

The ministry of education and that of home affairs have opted to collaborate in a bid to visit schools across the coun-

try and register the pupils who have no PINs so that they can get birth certificates, and PINs.

The collaboration was announced by Principal Secretary in the Home Affairs Department Anthony Masilela at a press briefing held at the ministry of education and training yesterday.

Masilela said parents were to blame for children who have no certificates as a child should have one within 60 days of birth at only E5, but the dilemma was now pinned on government because some parents were ignorant on doing the cer-

He said they had selected 10 schools from each of the four regions and the selection criteria was prioritising the schools with the highest number of pupils who have no PINs and that they will commence the registration process next

"The selected schools are prioritised because they have a high number of pupils with no PINs but we will continue with the schedule until we cover all the schools in the country.

We will have a programme that will tutor the parents on requirements for a child to be registered and if the requirements are not met then that child won't be registered," he said. The total number of pupils without PINs from the 40 selected schools stands at 4 502

Manzini has the highest at 1 695 while Shiselweni and Lubombo have 1 001 and 1 108 respectively. Hhohho was applauded for manning the issue, with only 696 pupils and being the lowest in

Registration to cost parents/guardians E25

DUE to late birth registration of the children enrolled in schools, parents or guardians will pay E20 as penalty and E5 for the certificate.

Parents were also urged to come with certified copies of the required documents or brace themselves to pay even extra costs to have that done for them.

Schoolboy (19) struck by lightning

A 19-year-old boy attending school at Nyakatfo High died after being struck by lightning while at home at Sidvwashini in the Northern Hhohho.

Nkhosikhona Dlamini was washing his school uniform when lightning struck on Sunday. The incident happened at around 16:00 hours.

According to the deceased's elder brother, Sizwe the young boy suffered head injuries, adding that he was discovered by his wife.

"My wife heard a loud scream and went out of the yard where he found her in-law lying helplessly on the ground," he said. She then went to notify other family members.

He said they first called the 977 Emergency Medical Services but they were far attending another emergency in Pigg's Peak. "We then reported the matter to police who also said they

did not have a car," he added.

He said they then used a private car to rush his younger brother to Dvokolwako

Health Centre. He was certified dead by a medical doctor "He was taken to Sikhwela Mtsini mortuary in Madlangemphisi," he said.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Chulani Mamba confirmed the incident. "On Sunday at 16:00 hours, a 19year-old man of Nyakatfo was struck by lightning and was certified dead at Dvokolwako Health Centre," confirmed

... ... CONSTRUCTION OF BOSCO-KAZAKHALI LINK ROAD BEGINS

CONSTRUCTION of the long awaited road that will provide a link between the Southern Distributor road (Bosco) and D98 (KaZakhali) in the southern part of the city is already underway.

Following an open procurement process, Pots Construction has been awarded the tender.

The project has been divided into two phases and the above-mentioned contractor is only responsible for the first one.

This entails construction of the road on either side of the still-to-be-

constructed bridge and will be completed within the next six months. The second phase will entail construction of a bridge that will connect the two road parcels. Funds are yet to be solicited for that part of the project.

One might wonder what necessitates construction of the road. The immediate reaction to that question would be that "it is a response to pleas from stakeholders".

It also forms part of the 2013-2018 Manzini Integrated Development Plan. Moreover, it is supported by the two traffic studies that have been done over the last two decades (the recent one having been done in 2013) as a means to find solutions to the obtaining congestion in the city. Those who usually use the recently rehabilitated D98 road (from Sihlahleni via KaZakhali up to the Zakhele Remand Centre) will attest to the horrifying congestion that prevails thereon during the morning and afternoon peak. Council is grateful to His Majesty's Government and the World Bank for their support towards ensuring the project is finally delivered.

...RUNNING A FOOD ESTABLISHMENT? EXPECT A HEALTH INSPECTOR'S VISIT SOON

YOU will recall, dear food establishment operator, that Council conducts grading of all food establishments in the city once every year.

Well, it is that time of the year when Council will be setting this exercise rolling; and this does not only affect food establishments that are located in the city centre but townships as well. Between today and July 2018, please expect a visit from Council's health inspectors. The sole purpose will be to conduct an inspection and find out whether or not your establishment still meets the health and hygiene standard as

spelt out in the Public Health Act, 1969. Food grading cards will thereafter be issued in accordance with the level of compliance; with the most compliant receiving an "A" and the least hygienic an "F" sticker. Food establishments that will receive grades A and B will also be issued with letters of appreciation and encouragement to improve on the minor shortfalls. This is a gesture meant to applaud their conformance to the city standards. Establishments graded C and below will be served with notices that set compliance timelines. Failure to meet the timelines will leave Council

With effect from June 1, a 15 per cent per annum interest will begin to take effect on the outstanding rates amounts. Well, this will not be the end of it as, at the end of June, those who will have still failed to pay in full will be served with letters of demand. That will, regrettably, mark the beginning of the legal route of collecting rates. All legal fees incurred during this process will be added onto the outstanding rates - and that is over and above the 15 per cent interest. Therefore, property owners are advised to escape this sad path and make means to either pay in full by end of day tomorrow or else agree on a payment

Fired SAPPI employees' reinstatement dismissed

FOUR employees of SAPPI Usuthu Pulp company who were fired from work have lost their last bid to be reinstated as the Industrial Court dismissed their application for reinstatement.

Industrial Court Judge Nkosinathi Nkonyane sitting with Assessors Gilbert Ndzinisa and Dan Mango held that the respondents (SAPPI) was able to prove on a balance of probabilities that the applicant's (four) dismissal was for a fair reason and also taking into account all circumstances of the case it was reasonable to terminate their services.

Judge Nkonyane when handing down the judgment stated that there was no allegation in the applicant's application that their dismissal was procedurally unfair and further that there was no evidence led before court that the dismissal was procedurally unfair.

The four, Thabsile Nkosi, Jabulani Mabuza, John Dlamini and Muzi Mthembu had claimed that their dismissal was unlawful and unfair because the company did not have valid and fair grounds for terminating their services.

They also alleged that in all the circumstances the termination of their services was unreasonable and they did not accept the decision for their dismissal and approached the Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC)

...Industrial Court holds that SAPPI was able to prove on a balance of probabilities that the four employees' dismissal was for a fair reason

where a certificate of unresolved dispute was

The respondents denied that the dismissal of the four was unfair or unlawful as they stated in court that dismissal was lawful in that the four were found guilty of dishonesty by the disciplinary tribunal.

The evidence led before court revealed that the four were in the human resources department while two others were in the finance department responsible for processing staff loans guided by the company staff loan policies which contained checks and balances.

The supervisor would sign and approve the granting of loans to applicants who had applied, however they did not adhere to the loans policy and that lead to the staff loan facility being abused as they did not file the applications forms or not fill information at all.

One of the four John Dlamini according to the judgment admitted during cross examination that names of children that appeared in his form were not his own children.

Judge Nkonyane noted that the evidence in court clearly showed that there was rampant abuse of the staff loans facility hence the application was dismissed.

Man arrested for 6 offences including resisting arrest

PIGG'S PEAK resident Phumlani Ginindza (31) has been arrested for six offences including failing to adhere to police instructions, resisting arrest and driving under the influence of alcohol.

Other offences faced by Ginindza included failing to indicate when making a turn and public endangerment by almost crashing into a police car.

He was arrested for these offences while driving his Toyota Hilux on Saturday evening at Kudvwaleni, along the MR1 public road.

According to Pigg's Peak police records, the accused was spotted by police turning into a sharp right hand corner heading towards Kudvwaleni High without indicating.

The sharp turn surprised police

who were driving in the opposite direction and it was then that the police ordered Ginindza to stop but he failed to do so. He drove off which prompted the police to chase after him in a patrol vehicle.


The chase is said to have lasted a few minutes resulting in police overtaking the suspect and blocking his path. After this, Ginindza alighted from his van and was tested for alcohol.

He failed the breathalyser test

as it indicated that the accused had consumed 0.97mg/l of alcohol, which is above the legal limit of 0.38mg/l.

Ginindza was then arrested but he resisted arrest as he refused to be handcuffed by officer, Mzwethu Khumalo. The officer later managed to effect arrest and the accused and he was taken to Buhleni Police Post, where he then tried to escape from lawful custody. However, Buhleni Police Officer Constable Bongani Masuku managed to subdue the accused. After the whole saga was over, Ginindza was brought before Pigg's Peak Magistrate Sabelo Khumalo who allowed him to be admitted to bail set at E3 000 for all the charges.

Khumalo went on to mention that the accused should appear again before the Pigg's Peak Magistrate's Court for his next remand next Monday.





LE'S BRO HONOURS LATE SISTER

...by doing charity work under Ndzingeni Inkhundla and surrounding areas.

HIS sister was brutally killed under mysterious circumstances in Mbabane and the killers are yet to be brought to face justice four years later.

The late Funekile's brother, Mbongeni Gule had, for the past three years, made Ndzingeni and surrounding places a hype of charitable activities.

The young energetic and God-fearing Mbongeni says all the work he h is done for Ndzingeni folks, which is his home area, is dedicated to his late sister Funekile - a former Swaziland Post and Telecommunications Corporation (SPTC) employee. Funekile

was brutally killed under mysterious circumstances on April 17, 2014 at Checkers in Mbabane, wherein reports claimed she was mauled by dogs that belonged to her former landlord Moses Dlamini. His charitable work has earned him respect. "Since God blessed me with a job I decided to help my area by bringing water, building for the poor

and ensuring pupils have school shoes. Charity begins at home hence I couldn't turn a blind eye when God blessed me. I dedicate this work to my late sister. However, I have been able to do this with the help of international donors," said Gule, who holds a diploma in mechanical engineering which he attained at Swaziland College of Technology (SCOT).

He said with the help of his sponsors, Dr. Huber Foundation and Rethink Africa Foundation, they have managed to install three boreholes within Ndzingeni. These boreholes, according to Gule, were installed in the same land that had been previously ruled by surveyors not to have water.

A young Asian had to part with E300 as admission of guilt after he was arrested for stealing a chocolate worth E9 at the Boxer Supermarket.



My baby mama beats me - man tells court

AN assertion by some organisations that certain men face physical abuse in the hands of their female counterparts came to the test at the Swazi National Court when a man alleged that his girlfriend was abusive.

Sikhumbuzo Mkhaliphi (35) was alleged to have assaulted one Sibongile Lukhele by hitting her with a stone on the forehead. The accused person and complainant were said to have been lovers and had two children together. They are currently staying separately after having misunderstandings in their relationship.

When the charge sheet was

read to him, the accused person pleaded not guilty to the charge.

Instead, he told the court that he was the one that had endured physical abuse in the hands of the complainant, something which eventually led to them parting ways.

Complainant

Mkhaliphi said on the day in question, he went to the complainant's home to check on his two children. He said however, he did not receive a warm welcome from the complainant as she started hurling unpalatable words towards him.

The accused person went on and revealed a scar on his arm which he claimed to have sustained after the complainant hit him with a rock.

On the other hand, the com-

plainant had no scars to show to the court.

"The complainant has always been abusive and would beat me with makeshift weapons whenever we had serious misunderstandings," the accused person claimed.

Meanwhile, the complainant stated that the accused person hit her with a rock after she had refused to talk to him.

When making judgment, Court President Makhuluma Ndwandwe noted that the accused person was the one who travelled to the complainant's parental home with the intention of provoking an argument.

The accused was therefore found guilty of the charge and was sentenced to four months in a correctional facility with a E400 fine option.



PENSIONERS DECRY INCONSISTENCY IN THEIR GRANTS

A week after they were scheduled to have received their grants, pensioners are still waiting in vain.

The specific date for the former government employees to receive their grants is the 21st of every month but they still hadn't received their money by the end of business yesterday.

One of the pensioners, Quinton Gama from Dlangeni had to come all the way to the Deputy Prime Minister's office to inquire about what has been causing the delay but he was told to be patient as the issue was being sorted.

"The problem began soon after the Swaziland Posts and Telecommunications Corporation was appointed government's agent in the issuing of the grants over a year ago.

The specific date was the 21st and the latest would be 23st of every month but now the dates vary a lot and it's frustrating us," he said.

Principal Secretary at the Deputy Prime Minister's office Khangeziwe Mabuza said there was no specific explanation for the issue except that they would launch investigations to find what caused the delay.

"We have already submitted the funds to the Treasury Department and we are hopeful that the pensioners will be sorted soon," she said.

The Mbabane Branch of Pensioners had a meeting recently at the National Library, where 18 of them were handed certificates after completing a course in Basic Computer Skills. Among the issues that they discussed is that of acquiring the services of a lawyer to take on government on issues pertaining the pensioner funds.

In their previous meeting held on April 18 at the same venue, one of the pensioners was quoted saying, "As the government/ Houses of Parliament will be dissolved very soon, each MP will take home more than a million Emalangeni each. So because government has no money, there is a high possibility that our money will be utilised."

NDZINGENI STILL NEEDS MORE BOREHOLES

HEAD of Communications at the Dr. Huber foundation Nomahlubi Dlamini said even though they have already installed three boreholes within a space of two years at Ndzingeni the area still needs more boreholes.

Dlamini was speaking to this publication on Monday after her foundation opened their third borehole at Ndzingeni last Friday. She went on to mention that each borehole had cost the foundation about E30 000 to dig and set up. This means that the Dr Huber Foundation has already spent E90 000 on boreholes at Ndzingeni alone.

Dlamini said the three boreholes were supporting more than 600 people, especially senior citizens who often lack safe drinking water.

"This is the third borehole which the foundation has unveiled at Ndzingeni in two years and each cost E30 000.

The costs include a borehole tank, pump, pipes as well as other fittings including

Information we have is that each of the boreholes support up to 200 people, but this number is expected to be higher as the region of Northern Hhohho has a very large population that is scattered.

All the boreholes we have dug are strategically placed within the communities so that residents don't have to travel long distances to draw safe and clean drinking water. Unfortunately, after consulting with the locals at Ndzingeni and surrounding areas we found that senior citizens are the most vulnerable when it comes to lack of safe drinking water," she said.

She said the reason they we are mentioning the senior citizens is because they cannot always travel to the boreholes and collect the water for themselves.

We know that unsafe water sources are littered with bacteria and parasites which

Imbita reintroducing itself to Northern Hhohho

Swaziland IMBITA Women's Finance Trust, which is a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO), is reintroducing itself to the people of Northern Hhohho.

The trust which was established by a group of women in Manzini, officially turns 27 this year.

The organisation chose to set up a gazebo outside the Pigg's Peak branch of Pep Stores last Wednesday to educate all the members of the public about the importance of saving money on a monthly basis.

Speaking to this publication, Insurance/Business Development Officer at Imbita Swaziland Sanele Mavuso said even though the organisation is listed as a women's finance trust it also allows men to register as members.

"The organisation provides financial solutions to all income earners, formal and non-formal, particularly those in a lower income brackets. As an organisation, since our inception in 1991, we have seen a lot of people struggling with the idea of saving money.

So, it is our job to educate our members on saving money from as little as only E65 a

We know that in that way, over 12 months our member would have saved up to E780 with some interest. This is an example as other members save E100 a month and in 12

months that member has E1 200, which gives our members that much needed financial freedom to pay school fees and other things. These savings can be accessed by the member every 12 months,"she said.

However, she said this is not the only benefit the organisation offers to members as they also offer short term loans where a member can access up to E25 000 from the credit team. "This loan is paid back at an agreed pace and such loans are predominantly used by members in our informal sector. These are people who cannot always access bank loans.

"Another service we offer is that of funeral benefits from as little as E300 per year, which cover allows up to six members to be listed as well as a spouse. There is no waiting period with this cover and it starts at E5000 all the way up to E30 000. Last but not least we also offer important classes like bookkeeping and other short courses to educate our members on how to make interest and save their money. The joining fee at Imbita is only E100," she added. Meanwhile, Marketing Officer at Imbita Swaziland Monalisa Dlamini said as time goes on the organisation, which has its headquarters in Manzini, will expand to other regions in the Kingdom of Eswatini like they did in the late 90's.

EVUSWENI WARRING FACTIONS EXCHANGE BLOWS IN COURT

THE Nhlangano Magistrate's Court premises were almost turned into a boxing ring as members of two factions from Evusweni contesting leadership nearly exchanged blows.

The factionalism in the community has dragged for a long time and it is said this has resulted on even development being greatly affected. The two factions are contesting for power in the area as there is one led by Reggie Lukhele and another led by Titus Mabuza.

Lukhele is considered Indvuna by the other faction while the other faction recognises Mabuza as the rightful Indvuna. The dispute has even been reported to the regional administrator's office as well as to BaKaNgwane but to date it's not yet known who between the two is the rightful authority. The factions have also been to court several times and the recent trip to court by both factions was last Thursday, where one of the factions had applied for a restraining order against the other. The Lukhele faction was



being challenged by those from Mabuza's camp against carrying out any activity at the *Umphakatsi*. With the two factions called to appear in court last Thursday, the court premises were tensely filled as members of both factions were seemingly keen on hearing the court ruling. Inside the courtroom, each faction kept making unpalatable remarks against the other and it is said there were even

threats issued.

The restraining order was before Magistrate Sihle Dludlu, who after consultation, ruled that the issue regarding matter, should be dealt with by the office of the Regional Administrator Themba Masuku.

Coincidentally, RA Themba Masuku was in another courtroom testifying in a similar matter which had to do with a chieftaincy dispute involving two Ndlela factions at Ezibondeni near Mhlosheni. Tension between the Evusweni factions was evident as one faction even raised a concern to the magistrate that there were threats issued against their lives.

It was then that Magistrate Dludlu ordered that there should be no threats or trouble while the issue is still being addressed by the relevant structures.

"The factions seemed to have decided to make the court premises a battle field.

There was a altercation even inside the courtroom before the magistrate called for calm as there was an exchange of heated words.

Others even called members of the other faction traitors and sellouts," said a source.

One of the sources said after the court had made the recommendation and what the two factions needed to do, someone was heard, referring to others from the rival faction as 'walking' coffins.

"Someone from one of the factions after the court ruled that the matter was to be dealt with by the relevant structures was not at all happy with the decision. He said at least eight coffins should be ready," said a source.

FPE exposes loopholes in education system

FOR the first time since the inception of the Free Primary Education system, government has expressed concern over the alarming decline in the number of pupils who make it to tertiary.

This was revealed by the Minister of education and training through Senior Secondary English Inspector Martha Shongwe during the Mkhiweni annual schools debate held at Emcozini High School Hall recently.

The minister said in a quest to produce learners that are able to contribute mearingfully towards the national vision and goals, one of the challenges that they contend with is limited career pathways offered to products of the education system whose ramifications are efficiencies such as high repetition rates and the majority of the learners are falling through the cracks.

"An example of that is, in the advent of Free Primary Education, we start off with almost 100 per cent enrolment at the lower levels of the education system and: by the time the pupils get to Form Five, only 20 per cent of the learners are able to sit for the SGCSE examinations.

Worse still, only about 15 per cent of these are able to enroll in tertiary institutions. This is a disquieting situation," he said.

Pathways

The minister said there was a need for the system to allow for the opening up of alternative career pathways not just to focus on the academic and professional pathways.

"Technical career pathways must be supported, especially because these are the pathways that drive any country's economy," he added,

Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) General Secretary Zweli Mndzebele said there were many contributing factors to the matter, one being the five per cent progression plan policy that was introduced by the government when introducing the FPE system.

"The policy hinders what teachers want to achieve as an end product because it entails that pupils progress to the next class even if they are not ready for that class. Now, when the time comes for the pupil to write the Primary Certificate examination, a majority of them fail.

The same policy doesn't apply in Form Three and the number continues to decline until only a limited number of pupils make it to tertiary," he said. Mndzebele said government should also consider the teacher pupil ratio as there are often over 50 pupils in one class whilst the teacher is expected to attend to each and every individual's hindrance. He also said that government must pay the PFPE grants on time so that teachers get all the necessary equipment to successfully articulate their duties.

ministry of health, through the ELMA Philanthropies project, had encountered challenges in some communities where some parents refuse their children to be tested for HIV.

"This (ELMA) is a three-year project aimed at ensuring that all children below 14 years are tested for

HIV and those found to be HIV positive enrolled to treatment," said Yende.

Yende described the event as a suc-

cess and said he was happy with the attendance.

On the other hand, the foundation's Outreach Manager Menzi Ginindza said while there was a notable improvement in the number of children tested early for HIV, there was still a challenge especially where parents should be playing their part.

"We still have a challenge as a number of parents are still refusing to conduct an HIV test for their children. It's our appeal to the parents that they should support this programme as it's for the benefit of these little souls," said Ginindza.

Community

At least close to 1 000 community members attended the event and the majority were children. Children below the age of 12 were in the company of their parents to enable them to undergo the HIV testing as per the policy, which states that those children under the age of 12 should get the green light from their parents to test.

Ginindza said it was not good for parents to deny their children from taking an early HIV test.

"Such behaviour defeats the efforts of the country in ensuring an AIDS free generation by the year 2022," said Ginindza.

He said the community aiders were doing commendable work by conducting the door to door sensitisation and mobilisation in the communities to ensure that children were tested for HIV as early as possible.

Parents refusing to early test for children to be arrested - RA

SHISELWENI Regional Administrator Themba Masuku has warned parents against refusing children an opportunity to undergo an early HIV test and initiation to treatment.

Speaking during a community event held at Nkomonye Chiefdom, under the newly established Ku-Methula inkhundla in the Shiselweni region, Masuku said it was a serious offence to deprive children the opportunity to undergo an HIV test and refusing to provide them with

the right treatment.

The former Deputy Prime Minister said the Children's Act was clear about the rights of children, hence it was important for everyone to ensure that children get the necessary support and best treatment.

The project is funded by the ELMA Philanthropies and aims at testing children below 15 years with all those found to be HIV positive enrolled to treatment early.

On Saturday, Elizabeth Glaser Peditric AIDS Foundation (EGPAF) visited the constituency where close to 1 000 people mostly being children were in attendance.

Remarks

In his remarks, the RA said any parent refusing children an HIV test and further refusing to have them enrolled for treatment deserved to be behind bars as they were not different from murderers.

"What this NGO is doing is commendable and we all should be supporting it. So these parents who are refusing children early enrolment to treatment, that is equivalent to murder and our office is to make sure that these culprits are brought to book," said Masuku.

The RA said his office will assist EGPAF in making sure that the exercise was carried out successfully in communities and they were receiving all the support needed.

He said social workers would be sent to all the facilities to check if there were children being deprived from treatment or testing and should there be parents found failing to cooperate they would be arrested.

"EGPAF and the ministry of health should be applauded for working directly with communities in sensitising and mobilising the testing of children to ensure early treatment for those found to be living with the virus," said Masuku, who is well-known for his passion for children. The event was also attended by Sandleni Member of Parliament Jameson Simelane who also applauded EGPAF for its important role in communities especially in sensitisation on HIV matters.

Nkomonye is part of KaLiba whose leader is Chief Mlotshwa Dlamini.

You look at the standards and immediately know that you could never be hot or sexy enough. You still comply anyway because that is what is "normal". Probably as normal as the era of wearing corsets.


Other writers argue that "it was vital to the creation of the ideal feminine shape, cinching in the waist but remaining desirably plump in other areas of the body.

Society has cultivated attitudes in men and boys that promote violence against women and

girls. The fathers whom the boys look up to and idolise have been beating their wives for as long as their children could see.

These are the children who hid under the kitchen tables when their father was chasing their mother around the house attitudes in men and boys with a knobkerrie.

Fast-forward to today, they cite their fathers as references in their arguments to justify why they abuse their wives. They find it normal because their fathers did it and their friends at Gobidolo Shebeen approve.

We clearly need to find a way to redefine these norms and influence the attitudes held by the people, especially men and boys about women if we are serious about eliminating gender based violence.

Girls and women who mutilate voluntarily mutilate themselves to fit-in need to hold a mirror against their faces and speak to themselves what it means to be "hot" and "sexy", if it is even necessary.

Before we are exposed to lack of freedom in our countries, may the first demand be freedom "in our bodies", from societal norms and attitudes.

Is there not a song that says "...even though we have potbellies, fat thighs, chubby arms...our hearts still give good loving"? Women refuse to be held hostage by these often ill-informed, short-sighted and sorry norms. Sometimes we will choose to not traumatise our bodies with spanx and waist-trainers. Hello, C-H-O-I-C-

Those biased against Israel complicit in Hamas propaganda

"THIS is the first government in history that has deliberately sought to compel its enemy to kill its own people."

Thus did Richard Kemp sum up the latest round of deadly confrontations along the Israel-Gaza border. A former British army colonel with thirty years of experience of counter-terrorism operations, Kemp has no doubt that Hamas, a radical Islamist faction whose totalitarian rule over Gaza has lasted for more than twelve years, is engineering deaths and injuries amidst its own civilian population in order to stir up international outrage against Israel. Through this horrendous tactic, the movement hopes to bring about Israel's international isolation, and eventual destruction.

It hardly needs to be pointed out that Kemp's hard-hitting analysis, nor any other piece similarly denouncing Hamas for its actions, will not have seen the light of day in any mainstream South African publication. Instead, on the local front it has been a case of near-ceaseless excoriation of Israel, often in terms so extreme as to border on hyste-

From the point of view of Hamas and those who share its zero-sum goal of wiping Israel off the map come what may, all this was just what the doctor ordered. Those who feel genuinely distressed over the ongoing plight of the Gaza population, however, should feel very differently about what is being allowed to happen.

Over sixty Palestinians were killed and many hundreds more injured in the course of violent clashes along

the Israel-Gaza border on 14 May. That this was a tragedy is something that nobody can deny, regardless of where they might stand on this most fraught of global conflicts. It was, however, a tragedy that would never have happened had it truly been the intention of Hamas to do no more than hold peaceful demonstrations. Amidst the frenzy of condemnation of Israel, the culpability of Hamas in orchestrating a situation in which civilian deaths and injuries were inevitable has been almost entirely overlooked.

Organising peaceful protests was never Hamas's intention. Its purpose, as its own spokesmen explicitly stated time and again, was to incite a mass invasion of Israeli territory, knowing very well that Israel could not and would not allow this. Hamas Prime Minister Yahya Sinwar pretty much put the real intention of his movement in a nutshell when he said: "We will tear down the border, and we will tear out their hearts from their bodies."

It has since been revealed, including by Hamas itself, that far from being "peaceful protestors", some 80 per cent of those killed in the violent clashes that took place on 14 May were active members of its armed wing. The "unarmed protesters" canard has likewise been disproved by the fact that during the demonstrations, militants fired on and threw grenades and pipe bombs at Israel soldiers and attempt-

ed to plant explosives along the border fence. In using unarmed Arab civilians behind whom to hide their weapons, it is Hamas and not Israel who are guilty of multiple war crimes.

No country can be expected to simply sit back and allow a mass invasion from a territory with which it is at war. This is even more the case when the tactic routinely used by the belligerent party has been to disguise combatants as civilians and use them to attack combatants and non-combatants indiscriminately.

The manner in which Hamas has pursued its war against the "illegitimate Zionist entity" has resulted in the traditional distinction between combatants and civilians being completely blurred, not just in terms of those who are targeted by its attacks, but in terms of those who perpetrate them.

Israelis have experienced countless instances of apparently harmless people suddenly pulling out a gun or a knife and attempting to kill as many innocent bystanders as they can, even if doing so means sacrificing their own lives. What may look like an unarmed civilian can easily turn out to be a human bomb - literally.

The reality that Israel faced last week was that every one of those who were trying to invade its territory was a potential mass murderer; it had no choice but to do whatever was needed to stop them. The Israeli Defence Force tried to pre-empt the violence by dropping leaflets warning Palestinians not to approach the border fence, nor participate in the Hamas display that was putting them at risk.

University writing groups provide an unexpected space for change Authors

IN a seminal paper on what constitutes quality in education, scholars Lee Harvey and Diana Green argue that a "quality education" is one in which a student expe riences a "personal transformation" as a result of enhancing and empowering mechanisms.

They claim that students are "enhanced" when they are positioned at the centre of the learning and assessment process, and are "empowered" through being involved in the decision-making around their own transformation.

Such transformation conversations, especially in African contexts, almost always include contested debates on curriculum. Notably, scholars have highlighted how the problem is not on'

what universities teach - that is, the curriculum - but also the way they teach it. This refers to ways of teaching that can sufficiently engage with and problematise "normal" practices in higher education spaces. So the question becomes: what can universities do to enhance both personal and curriculum transformation? We set about answering this question in a study about university writing groups. These groups are inspiring and empowering spaces run by and for students. Here, students use feedback from peers to develop their writing practices. It's a collaborative and collegial environment.

Writing groups might also have unexpected benefits for transformation, as our research has shown. In South Africa, calls for the decolonisation of university practices and curriculum have dominated transformation conversations. Writing groups provide a space where students can learn and engage with these complex issues.

Our study focused on a writing

group programme at a researchintensive university in South Africa. Data from the initial pilot programme as well as the 13 current groups were collected through anonymous reviews and interviews with participants. The groups are multidisciplinary in composition although we made a general divide between the Natural Sciences and Humanities. Each group consists of about six and eight students with meetings co-ordinated by a PhD student or post-doctoral fellow. Our findings show that writing groups can play a key role in transforming students by providing a space where their own "voice" can be developed in their writing! Developing a sense of voice is a difficult part of academic writing and takes a lot of practice. The regular, constructive and encouraging feedback from peers and the long-term, ongoing interaction provides a consistent and supportive network that students value. This suggests steps towards transformation in both the way we teach

academic writing and the individual student's writing practices.

We found that the collegial "safe space" offered by writing groups allows for students' emotional wellbeing to be actively supported by a committed community of scholars. Being untied from evaluation, students can engage freely without risk of judgement. Writing groups are also seen to provide a space for students to experiment with, and explore their changing identities.

Altering practice The teaching structure of writing groups is also important; these are not "top-down" spaces. Rather, they are organised, maintained and led by the students themselves; creating an egalitarian setting where students can develop their practices in a flexible, supportive environment.

But perhaps of most interest was the ways in which the writing groups also played a key role in transforming practice.

SOUTH Africa's two biggest opposition parties are going to be badly bruised in the coming general election if they can't get over their Zuma hangover soon and start inspiring voters with alternative visions of a better future.

When Mmusi Maimane and Julius Malema opened their newspapers on Sunday morning and read that, according to an Ipsos poll, 76 out of a hundred South Africans think Cyril Ramaphosa is doing a good job, they must have choked on their porridge.

Only twenty out of a hundred thought that Jacob Zuma was an okay president in an opinion poll late last year. Zuma really spoilt the opposition parties - he was their most effective campaigner.

If Ramaphosa is indeed going to call an early election in October or November, as some of his advisers believe he should, I think the DA would struggle to get over 20 per cent of the vote and the EFF over 10 per-

The DA drew 22.2 percent of the vote in 2014 and 26.9 percent in the local elections of 2016. The EFF got 6.3 percent in 2014 and 8.2 percent in 2016.

Interestingly, the IFP is the one opposition party that could benefit from the Ramaphosa phenomenon. Indications are that some aggrieved Zulu nationalists and Zuma loyalists could switch from the ANC to the IFP in protest and that some traditional IFP supporters who had abandoned the party for the ANC when Zuma became president could go back to it. Perhaps the IFP could get closer to 10 per cent this time?

They came on metal chariots with wings, like goddesses to battle for other women to have the rights to self-determination and bodily auton-

On Friday last week, thousands of Irish women who live abroad travelled home to vote in a referendum on whether their home country should relax its strict abortion laws, proudly reporting on their actions with the #HomeToVote hashtag. In total, 3.5 million people headed to the polls

People came from as far abroad as Australia, China, Argentina and South Africa to vote in this landmark referendum. Women living in Ireland welcomed the homecomers with signs saying, "Thank you for making this journey so other women don't have to" - a reference to the trip that many scared young Irish women have to make out of their home country to have abortions in England

Pro-choice campaigners say that 170 000 women have made this journey to seek medical care far from home as they face the most difficult decision of their lives. The results speak for themselves, with 66.4 per cent of voters opting to repeal a con-

But if the election is only going to take place in June or July next year, the Ramaphosa government will have to prove that there was some substance to the promise of a New Dawn. That's not going to be easy.

The land issue could become his biggest stumbling block if his efforts at finding compromises don't get popular support. Expectations are irrationally high.

The EFF's problems to show continued growth - I believe they're talking about aiming for upwards of 16 per cent of the vote - became clear with their actions in Parliament last week.

Malema made a typical bombastic Zuma-era speech with personal attacks, insults, threats and petty, cheap, populist comments.

Now that the ANC has also announced that it is willing to accept the expropriation of land without compensation, Malema had to go one step further and encourage the illegal occupation of land.

When Malema was called to order, his gang in red started banging on the desks chanting Occupy the Land!

Does the EFF leadership really think this will have the same legitimacy and popularity as the chant of Pay Back the Money?

I'm beginning to think that the EFF is underestimating the extent to which ordinary South Africans have moved on after Zuma. Perhaps the EFF's mistake is to believe the racial outrage they see on social media reflects the true feelings of the people of the coun-

Older voters and those from the broad middle classes do not support

the chaos brought on by illegal land occupations and the proposal that noone but the state should own land is not a popular one.

Maimane made a much more sober and sophisticated speech during the same debate in Parliament, but his party's identity crisis is no smaller than the EFF's. Black South Africans who were so repulsed by Zuma's crudeness and corruption that they switched to the DA are still maligned by many in the communities and the media because they are supporting a "white-dominated" party.

The obvious difference in nuance

and style between black and white DA leaders makes it easier for them to join the Ramaphosa fan club, while the clumsy handling of the Patricia de Lille case did nothing to restore faith in the party.

If it is true that there are a few DA personalities who want to break away to form a "pure liberal" party, and I can hardly believe anybody would be stupid enough to think this would gain any traction at all, then perhaps it would strengthen Maimane's hand.

Our democracy needs a strong, effective opposition.

Abortion is a sensitive and divisive issue, across all gender lines, classes, races and religions. To the women who voted the other

way, to the sisters for whom this vote has been a painful loss, I would also like to extend a hand in empathy. I understand that for you, abortion is murder, the loss of a soul, and an unacceptable crime against God's will. There is very little that anyone can say to make this easier, to change your mind that a woman's right to choose should trump the rights of a collection of cells that have the potential to become a human. I am not here to try to convince you or to try to change your minds. But I do understand that for hundreds of thousands of frightened or angry young women, Ireland now feels like a safer place to call home. There have been calls to name the new legislation Savita's Law, after Savita Halappanavar, a 31-year-old dentist who died from an infection after miscarrying her first child in an Irish hospital in 2012. She pleaded for a termination during the miscarriage but was refused because there was still a foetal heartbeat. eNCA

freshness in-store. Litchfield said their outlet happens to be the OK brand's Southern African flagship store because no other store in the franchise has been built with their current specifications. He promised that it was all systems go for Friday's grand opening as 90 per cent of stock has already been delivered, except the fresh foods which will be delivered a day before the opening. Having been in the Fast Moving

Consumer Goods (FMCG) industry for 15 years, the general manager promised a unique shopping experience for OK Foods customers especially with the outlet being located in a budding outlaying business district as opposed to the over-traded central business district of Mbabane which is often marred by traffic congestion and shopper parking blues.

DISCOUNT RATE REMAINS UNCHANGED AT 6.75 PER CENT

DUE to Eswatini's tight linkages with the South African economy, it is envisaged that the Central Bank of Swaziland (CBS) will continue conforming to the South African Reserve Bank's (SARB) policy movements, NKC African Economics Analyst Jee-A van der Linde has said. Van der Linde's prediction follows an announcement made by CBS on Monday that the country's discount rate would remain unchanged at 6.75 per cent.

"The decision was in line with our expectations and followed the South African Reserve Bank's decision on May 24, to keep the repo rate unchanged at 6.5 per cent," van der Linde observed. The CBS highlighted that the global economy continued to show positive growth – led by momentum in trade and

investment

"The CBS also cited regional developments in South Africa as an important factor for its decision: during its recent meeting, the SARB Governor Lesetja Kganyago noted that South Africa's inflation outlook had deteriorated somewhat since the previous meeting of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), owing to a weaker rand exchange rate and the recent spike in international oil prices, while a disappointing economic performance in Q1 2018 also suggests that Africa's most industrialised economy is still struggling to gain momentum," van der Linde said in an analysis of the recent policy developments.

In the meantime, Eswatini's headline inflation accelerated in April to 4.8 per cent year-on-year, up from 4.0 per cent year-on-year in March. The rise in overall inflation was mainly attributed to an increase in the price index for housing

and utilities, which surged to 13.3 per cent year-on-year in April buoyed by a 15 per cent year-on-year increase in 'actual rentals' prices.

Higher electricity tariffs were also a notable contributor in April, with the energy sub-index up by 15.0 per cent year-on-year. According to the CBS, inflation averaged 4.3 per cent during the first quarter and the central bank has kept its inflation forecasts for Q2 and Q3 unchanged at 5.26 per cent and 5.6 per cent respectively, while stating that: "The proposed increase in value-added tax (VAT) and rising oil prices will result in inflation rising over the [forecast] period".

In a further commentary on the statusquo, van der Linde observed that the CBS maintained the status quo following its recent loosening cycle, highlighting some potential upside risks to the consumer price inflation outlook.

According to SEDCO Managing Director Dorrington Matiwane the programme is part of the One House One Product (OHOP) campaign conceived five years ago by SEDCO.



Nurseries failing to meet local fruit tree demand

LOCAL nurseries are currently finding it hard to keep up with the high demand of fruit trees in the country as SEDCO had to get their recent supply from an accredited nursery Tzaneen in South Africa, it has emerged.

The shortfall was disclosed by SEDCO Managing Director Domington Matiwane yesterday at Lobamba High School The Tzaneen nursery currently supplies a big part of the continent as their reach goes as far as West, North and Southern parts of the continent.

The current shortfall presents a business opportunity which local farmers are not taking advantage of. Matiwane said in the event they get supply from local farmers, some of the trees do not bear fruits. He said this was another reason why SEDCO had to outsource the supply of fruit

trees for the programme.

The process of getting fruit trees was also described by Matiwane as being cumbersome as the supplier dispatches stock only once a year. This means SEDCO has to make an order a year in advance. Matiwane said the process was slow and inconveniencing as the programme is also adversely affected.

Most fruit trees fully bear fruit after three years of planting, depending on the area and the care that is given to each plant. If the tree gets the right supply of water coupled with the necessary fertiliser they bear fruit within the first year.

Pruning also plays a big part because it allows trees to grow faster. Local farmers were encouraged to take advantage of the existing gap in the fruit tree market and to also ensure that the currency circulates in the local economy.

THE Monaco GP has always been a game changer in the Formula 1 season.

The Circuit de Monaco is a street circuit which makes use of the streets of Monte Carlo passing through some of the most exquisite hotels and yacht marinas.

This year Monaco hosted the 6th

round of the F1 season and this had drivers, teams and fans out for blood. Only 6 rounds into the 21-round season and yet it feels like so much has happened and in all honesty a lot has transpired. Hailed for being one of the most unforgiving tracks in the F1 calendar, Circuit de Monaco didn't waste time in

such as Sirotkin who earned himself a puncture in FP1 (Final Practice) session. Redbull was in great form into their 250th race in F1. Mercedes and Ferrari were also in great form making for an entertaining and thrilling race. Pirelli introduced a new tyre, Hypersoft, which is the softest compound to ever be used in F1 and has a 9 lap lifespan. This tyre helps drivers to clock in blistering laps but it also forces teams to be as accurate as possible on which stage of the race they could be introduced and when they could call in drivers to change for a fresh set. Max Verstappen missed qualifying as the Redbull team had to change his gearbox which meant he started at the back of the pack, meanwhile his teammate Daniel Ricciardo managed a blistering time of 1:10:810 earning him his 2nd time on pole for the 2nd time on the streets of Monte Carlo.



Ricciardo led the pack from start and went into pits for a tyre change in the 17th lap, maintaining his lead after the Redbull team timed his pit-stop impeccably changing into a set of hypersoft.

McLaren's Alonso had to retire from the Monaco GP after a power failure. Verstappen fought hard to break away from the bottom 6. Verstappen's fight for 9th place against Renault's Carlos Sainz was the most entertaining brawl of the Monaco GP where Verstappen kept the pressure on Sainz long enough for him to make a mistake which Verstappen then capitalized and earned 9th place. Alfa Romeo's Leclerc locked up his right wheel and failed to slow down crashing into the rear of Torro Rosso's Brendon Hartley, forcing both to retire friom the race.

This was a blow to Leclerc as this was his first Formula 1 GP in





HONDA CIVIC TYPE R PICKUP TRUCK CONCEPT REVEALED

EVER thought of a way to make a hot hatch more practical? I'm sure you have, well Honda UK has taken the wraps off the Civic Type R Pickup Truck concept as part of the annual Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders (SMMT) Test Day.

Dubbed as "potentially one of the fastest pickup trucks on UK roads", the wild utility concept is the product of a specialist team from the Product Engineering department at the company's Swindon factory. Known as 'Project P' internally, the Type R Pickup Truck started life as a pre-production version of the UK-built hot hatch, and was then modified from the B-pillar rearward to install a flatbed loading area where the rear seats and boot would normally be.

Despite the extensive modifications, the concept retains the massive rear wing of the base car, while also featuring the same 228kW/400Nm 2.0-litre turbocharged four.

Honda claims Project P is capable of completing the 0-100km/h sprint

Firstly, the new engine option replaces the pre-facelift range's 1.5-litre oiler. Outputs for Japan are rated at 85kW of power at 4000rpm, and 270Nm of torque from 1600 to

2600rpm – that's up 8kW on the old motor, while peak torque is available for an additional 100rpm. Both the new diesel and revised 2.0-litre petrol engine (which gets a 1kW power bump) meet new Euro 6d-temp emission standards, including the real-drive emission test (RDE).

In addition to the upgrades detailed at the New York motor show – which include LED tail-lights, revised alloy wheels, and a redesigned centre console with armrest and electronic park brake – the Japanese-market version also gets the latest version of Mazda's autonomous emergency braking sys-

tem, which can now detect pedestrians at night time. The upgraded safety suite also includes the availability of adaptive cruise control with stop&go for the first time, along with an auto-dimming rear-view mirror for enhanced visibility.

Finally, there's a special launch model in the Japanese range which features 'deep red' nappa leather upholstery (pictured) with contrast-

leatherette highlights. The trim around the centre tunnel also gets a leatherette trim in certain grades. The compact SUV has earned a place in the hearts of emaSwati which should be valid reason to introduce the 2019 facelifted CN:-3 to the eSwatini market.





AUDI has once again previewed its upcoming Q8 SUV-coupe combination crossover, this time in a new video as part of its #Q8unleashed web series.

Scheduled to be revealed at the Audi China Brand Summit in Shenzen – which kicks off on June 5 – the upcoming crossover flagship makes a brief cameo in the three-minute clip, which focuses on a fictional couple that have their world turned upside down.

Not much can be seen of the Q8

other than its bright orange (like the show car) paintwork, badge and electric tailgate opening, but at least we know there's some bright colours planned for the new model's palette. It was recently teased in a designer sketch (pictured), which shows a fastback-style tailgate that isn't far off the design of the related Lamborghini Urus.

On the inside, the Q8 features a version of the dual-touchscreen setup we've already seen on the latest A8, A7 and A6 models. Under the skin,

the Q8 rides on the Volkswagen Group's MLB Evo platform for frontand all-wheel drive cars with a longitudinal engine. As such, it will share a lot in common with the Q7, Lamborghini Urus, Bentley Bentayga, Porsche Cayenne, and Volkswagen Touareg. We expect to see turbocharged V6 and V8 drivetrains powering the new Q8 range, and potentially a plug-in hybrid.

TOYOTA, SUZUKI TO COLLABORATE ON MODEL SHARING, GREEN DRIVETRAIN TECH

LAST week Toyota and Suzuki announced the next steps in their emerging partnership, with the initial focus being India and emerging markets in Africa, along with three key areas of co-operation.

Discussions will begin immediately on how Toyota and Denso, its wholly owned parts supplier, can provide "technological support" to Suzuki in its quest to develop a "compact, ultra-high efficiency drivetrain". The two companies will also see which Suzuki models can

be produced by Toyota Kirloskar Motor, the company's majority-owned affiliate in India. Any Suzuki-developed vehicles built there will be sold through both Toyota and Suzuki's sales channels.

Lastly, Toyota and Suzuki will discuss which models can be exported from India to Africa and other emerging markets. These cars will be sold through Suzuki and Toyota dealers in those export regions. This latest announce-

ment builds on a partnership established in October 2016 focused on safety, green vehicles, and information technology.

Toyota, while the much larger automaker of the two, lags well behind Suzuki in India. Given Maruti Suzuki's stranglehold on the Indian market, all other car makers have been left trailing in its wake. There's also facelifted and updated versions of earlier models, like the Alto K10, which was originally launched in 2000, and the Wagon R.





ANC STRUGGLING TO RESULVE NORTH WEST LEADERSHIP ISSUES

JOHANNESBURG - The African National Congress (ANC) is in a race to appoint a premier for the North West after the party top brass reportedly shot down three names put forward at the governing party's national executive committee meeting over the weekend.

Apart from the North West matter, the ANC NEC meeting had to attend to other top contentious issues - the continuing political killings in KwaZulu-Natal, land expropriation without compensation following adoption of resolutions at the party's land summit that have to be ratified at the NEC, and a replacement of former premier Supra Mahumapelo in the troubled platinum province.

It remains to be seen whether the governing party has agreed on Mahumapelo's replacement. The post-NEC briefing will be held on Tuesday afternoon.

Secretary General Ace Magashule told reporters on Saturday that there needed to be "further consultation" with the North West ANC following the rebuff of three names, who are reportedly allies of

Mahumapelo.

"The provincial executive committee is supposed to give us three names, they have done so but we further want to engage with the PEC as well as other structures so that we resolve problems facing the North West once and for all," Magashule said.

Media reports suggested the three candidates were former education MEC O.J Tselapedi, agriculture MEC Manketsi Tlhape and acting ANC provincial secretary general, Susan Dantjie.

Embattled Mahumapelo finally stepped down last week, citing a decision to take an "early retirement." Mahumapelo was under pressure to resign after residents in Mahikeng went on the rampage in April calling for Mahumapelo to resign over allegations of corruption. The widespread protests shut down the province's capital Mahikeng, looting shops and damaging property.

A ministerial task team led by minister in the presidency Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma investigated governance issues in the North West, resulting in President Cyril Ramaphosa placing the province under the control of the national government in terms of section 100 of the Constitution. *African News Agency*

Esidimeni families still awaiting compensation from government

JOHANNESBURG - Families of Life Esidimeni victims are still waiting for compensation from the Gauteng government, a provincial legislator revealed yesterday.

"The Gauteng Provincial Government has not yet made payments to the families of the Life Esidimeni patients who suffered and died, even though Justice Dikgang Moseneke set 19 June as the deadline for his arbitration award, which is only three weeks away," DA MPL Jack Bloom said in a statement.

"This is revealed by Gauteng Premier David Makhura in a written reply to my questions in the Gauteng Legislature."

Makhura said the process was under way and that officials were verifying the banking details of beneficiaries? ciaries. He said the government would meet the deadline.

Bloom said he was concerned about the source of the funding, which he estimated could easily top R160.64 million, taking into account new claimants.

"It is unclear where the money will be found to pay for this as Makhura says that 'The Provincial Executive Council (Exco) is finalising all consultations with national department of Health on this matter and an update report will be given to the legislature in due course."

Bloom said the Esidimeni compensation should not be paid by the "hard-pressed budget of the Gauteng Health Department which is struggling to provide a decent health service." *Sowetanlive*

Seven suspects arrested for Polokwane cash-in-transit heist

POLOKWANE, Limpopo - Seven suspects have been arrested after a cash-in-transit van was robbed on Monday along Matlala Road in Polokwane, Limpopo.

Some of the suspects were arrested on Monday night and others during the early hours of Tuesday morning

The robbers made off with an undisclosed amount of money after firing several shots before blowing up the vehicle. The SAPS recovered two bullet-riddled cars, rifles, ammunition, cartridges, explosives and money bags in Seshego. The vehicles are believed to have been stolen in Gauteng. Police say more arrests are imminent. eNCA

NPA has failed miserably in Vrede Dairy investigation — legal expert

JOHANNESBURG - The NPA's Asset Forfeiture Unit (AFU), which recently obtained a provisional restraint order against eight accused in the Estina Vrede Dairy project, has failed miserably, a legal expert has said.

Advocate Deon Pool told News24 on Monday that the first mistake the NPA made was to advertise in the media that they were going after the assets.

"A preservation order, by nature, is done in chambers and it is supposed to be a secret," Pool said, shortly after the Free State High Court ruled in favour of Guptalinked companies and individuals who challenged a provisional restraint order targeting assets estimated at R250m.

The restraint order was obtained in April, but the criminal case is still pending. "The first time they did it, they failed miserably and, the second time, they also failed miserably. They did not learn from their mistakes," Pool said.

He said Judge Philip Loubser had highlighted in his ruling that the affidavit prepared by the NPA was lacking, and that the allegations made amounted to speculation. "One would expect that the matter that carries such high profile would at least be considered along the lines of, 'do we at least have enough?'.

"One would think that [National Prosecuting Authority head] Shaun Abrahams would at least read affidavits and ensure that [it is] water tight and not challenged. The bottom line is that it is concerning that the judge said this is incompetence."

'We are on track' Pool also added that the NPA's loss did not mean that they could not proceed with the case. Meanwhile, NPA spokesperson Luvuyo Mfaku said they would be filing a forfeiture application soon, adding that their loss was not a reflection of the strength of their criminal case against the eight accused.

Gupta-linked companies win battle over assets worth R250m

BLOEMFONTEIN - The National Director of Public Prosecutions (NDPP) on Monday suffered a major blow after the Free State High Court released all the assets belonging to companies and individuals linked to the controversial Gupta family that had been preserved.

The assets at issue are worth about R250 million. Judge Phillip Jacobus Loubser was sharply critical of the state case from the beginning of his judgement saying the NDPP had failed to satisfy the court and that it had a strong case against the accused.

"This issue is neither here nor there, I do not propose that we take it any further," said Loubser as he concluded his judgement.

Loubser said there no reasonable grounds for the court to believe that there could be a confiscation order applicants and gave a costs order against the state.

"The provisional restraint order is discharged with costs," he said. The application was brought by

32 die in Ethiopia landslides

ADDIS ABABA - Landslides caused by heavy rain killed at least 32 people in southern Ethiopia at the weekend, the government said on Monday.

Nine people died in the Gamo Gofa zone, with 17 injured.

The state-affiliated Fana Broadcast Corporate reported that 23 people were killed in a land-slide in the Sidama zone.

Six people were badly injured, Fana reported. Countries across the Horn of Africa (Djibouti, Eritrea, Ethiopia, and Somalia) have recently struggled to cope with heavy rains.

Last week, flooding and strong winds caused by Cyclone Sagar killed at least 25 people in Djibouti and Somaliland, while heavy flooding left 21 dead in Somalia, according to the UN's humanitarian coordinator OCHA. AFP

Burundi angered by French gift of donkeys

NAIROBI - Burundi's Agriculture Ministry has ordered the quarantine of 10 donkeys donated to a central village through French funding, sparking a debate over the subliminal message behind the gift.

The donkeys, bought in Tanzania, were given to residents of a village in Gitega province, as part of a project by a local NGO to help women and children transport agricultural products, water or wood.

However, a presidential adviser described the project as "an insult to the nation".

Gabby Bugaga, spokesman for the Senate president, wrote on Twitter that the French were "taking us for donkeys".

"Be honest, is the donkey a symbol of a quality or a flaw?" he wrote. Donkeys are not indige-

nous to Burundi. On Sunday, Agriculture Minister Deo Guide Rurema asked a local administrator to "facilitate the immediate withdrawal of all donkeys that have been distributed ... without respecting the technical procedure of the distribution of exotic animals". On Thursday, the day the project was inaugurated, French Ambassador Laurent Delahousse praised "the introduction of the Land Cruiser of the animal kingdom to Burundi". After the controversy, he said that to his knowledge "all procedures were respected". A European diplomat, speaking on condition of anonymity, said Burundi was hitting back at France over a statement criticising a referendum earlier this month that reformed the constitution, allowing President Pierre Nkurunziza to seek another two terms in office and remain in power until 2034. AFP

TOP AIDE TO N. KOREAN LEADER LANDS IN SINGAPORE

...as summit preparations advance

TOKYO/SEOUL – A top aide to North Korean leader Kim Jong Un arrived in Singapore on Monday night, Japanese public broadcaster NHK said yesterday, the latest indication that the on-again-off-again summit with US President Donald Trump may go ahead.

Kim Chang Son, Kim's de facto chief of staff, flew to Singapore via Beijing on Monday night, the report said.

At the same time, a team of US government officials, including the White House Deputy Chief of Staff For Operations Joe Hagin, left US Yokota Air Base in Japan for Singapore on Monday, NHK said. The White House said a "pre-advance" team was traveling to Singapore to meet with North Koreans. The reports indicate that planning for the historic summit, initially scheduled for June 12, is moving ahead after Trump called it off last week. A day later, Trump said he had reconsidered, and officials from both countries were meeting to work out details. When Kim Chang Son was asked by a reporter at the Beijing airport if he was flying to

Singapore for talks with the United States, he said he was "going there to play," according to footage from Nippon Television Network.

Meanwhile, North Korea's Kim Yong Chol, a senior official dealing with inter-Korean affairs was scheduled to fly to the United States on Wednesday after speaking to Chinese officials in Beijing, South Korea's Yonhap news agency said citing an unnamed source.

Due to sanctions against him, Kim Yong Chol is banned from visiting the United States normally. His visit to the United States would indicate a waiver was granted. The United States and South Korea blacklisted Kim Yong Chol for supporting the North's nuclear and missile programmes in 2010 and 2016, respectively.

Yonhap added Choe Kang II, a North Korean foreign ministry official involved with North America issues, was also spotted at Beijing Capital International Airport. Yonhap did not say whether Choe would be accompanying Kim Yong Chol.

Palestinian president Abbas leaves hospital

RAMALLAH - Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas left hospital on Monday after eight days of treatment for pneumonia.

His hospital stay led to intense speculation over the 83-year-old's condition and who will eventually replace him.

Dressed in a suit and walking without assistance, Abbas gave a short statement on being discharged, saying he planned to be back at work in his office as normal yesterday.

"Thanks to God, I left the hospital today in good health and return to work starting tomorrow," he said, speaking vigorously and with his two sons by his side. He thanked all international leaders who had called about his health and wished him well. The hospital stint came at a time of heightened US pressure on Abbas and the Palestinian Authority.

Some analysts said Abbas would now seek to refocus on work and downplay talk of stepping down. He is expected to preside over a meeting of the central council of his Fatah party on Tuesday.

Known to be a heavy smoker, Abbas was admitted on 20 May 2018 the Istishari Arab Hospital near Ramallah in the occupied West Bank with complications following an ear operation, including high fever. Officials have since said he was being treated for pneumonia.

His extended hospitalisation led to widespread speculation over whether his condition was worse than the details being disclosed.

No successor is publicly in line for the Palestinian presidency, which has added to concerns over Abbas's health. Abbas won a four-year term as president in 2005, but he has since remained in office without further elections.

He argues the split between his Fatah party and Islamist movement Hamas, which controls the Gaza Strip, has made elections politically impossible. A moderate, Abbas has been involved in decades of negotiations with Israel but is unpopular among Palestinians, with the majority wanting him to step down.

Rally calls on May to ease rules

BELFAST – Hundreds of women's rights activist rallied in Belfast on Monday to put pressure on British Prime Minister Theresa May to reform Northern Ireland's highly restrictive abortion rules after neighbouring Ireland's vote to liberalise its laws. Voters in Ireland on Friday backed the removal of a constitutional abortion ban by two-to-one. That leaves British-ruled Northern Ireland as the only part of the British Isles with a restrictive abortion regime, and May on Sunday faced calls from within her cabinet and the opposition to scrap Northern Ireland's strict rules. *Reuters*

Filmmakers rise up against 'archaic' restrictions

NAIROBI – Kenyan filmmakers have urged authorities to revamp a 1960s law that threatens them with jail if they do not pay for a license and imposes other restrictions they say are stifling their resurgent industry. Directors and producers poured onto social media this week to protest after the regulator printed adverts in newspapers reminding them of the terms of the legislation, which dates back to British colonial rule. The Kenya Film Classification Board - which has to check scripts before filming begins under the law and classifies movies. *Reuters*

French peace initiative rejected by militias

JOHANNESBURG – France's plan to host a UN-sponsored conference on Libya aimed at securing elections in the North African country and commitments to a joint political roadmap from its warring factions, is already on shaky ground with the country's most powerful brigades in the west rejecting the deal. The conference was due to kick off at the Elysee Palace yesterday, bringing together key Libyan players and representatives of two dozen countries and international organisations. Libya's rival leaders were expected to adopt a statement calling for presidential and parliamentary elections, "if possible" by the end of the year. African News Agency



Mnangagwa urged to end police brutality

HARARE - A coalition of Zimbabwean human rights groups is calling on President Emmerson Mnangagwa to end abuses perpetrated by the country's police officers. During former president Robert Mugabe's nearly 40-year rule the police force was deployed to target opposition supporters and human rights activists. The Zimbabwe Human Rights NGO Forum, which represents 22 organisations, says police officers are still using arbitrary arrests to intimidate citizens. During the launch of its latest human rights report, the forum said it had received complaints about 52 unlawful arrests and harassment in 2017. AFP

Rockets fired into Israel, warplanes attack

GAZA/TEL AVIV – Palestinians in Gaza fired several rockets into Israel early yesterday, an Israeli military spokesperson confirmed. The military said Israel's Iron Dome anti-missile shield shot down a "barrage of rockets", causing warning sirens to sound in several southern towns near the strip, warning residents to find shelter from possibe rocket fire. No further details were given. It was not immediately clear whether any rockets landed in Israeli territory, the military statement said. Yesterday marked the first time rockets had been fired into Israel since a new wave of mass Palestinian protests began in Gaza on 30 March. AFP

"We have a standard charge of E5 000 when performing internationally excluding transport and accommodation.

This is really not enough for us but there is nothing we can do about it because we need the gigs," cried out the spinner.

On the other hand, one of the DJ's who spoke on condition of anonymity also shared his counterpart's sentiments, stating that their low charges worked against progress

"As a DJ, you need to build a brand for yourself.

Look at how Black Coffee has built his brand. Advice to the other spinners is that we need to be creative and bring some innovation on the turn tables, different styles. By so doing, a lot can change in this industry. Right now I feel like we just imitating South African DJs instead

of creating our set." he said.



'Karius won't play for Liverpool again'

LIVERPOOL - Liverpool goalkeeper Loris Karius will not play for the club again following his howlers in the Champions League final against Real Madrid, according to former midfielder Danny Murphy.

The German shot-stopper was left in tears as he gifted Karim Benzema the opening goal before failing to make a routine save from Gareth Bale's long-range shot in Saturday's grand finale.

Along with Sergio Ramos, who injured Mohamed Salah in the first half, Karius has become a target for heart-broken supporters, and Murphy believes it will prove to be the last thing he does in a Liverpool shirt.

'I actually feel sorry for him. I really do,' Murphy told talkSPORT. 'Nobody goes into a game wanting to make mistakes. 'Unfortunately I don't think he'll play in a Liverpool shirt again. It's impossible for him. 'I think the magnitude of the mistakes and the enormity

of the game, the supporters will struggle with him being in goal for them.

'And the continual ribbing he will get week in, week out, wherever he goes — that's going to be huge pressure for him. I just can't see him playing again. That's not being dramatic, that's a reality of the situation.'

Even without Salah, Liverpool were containing the threat

from Real
Madrid before Karius attempted to throw the ball across the path of Benzema early in the second half. Benzema managed to intercept the throw and the ball dribbled into the net. His failure to keep hold of Bale's shot, which made it 3-1, also killed off any chance of a come-

back after the Welshman had regained the lead with an incredible bicycle kick following Sadio Mane's equaliser. The goal-keeper has already left on holiday after being left out of Germany's World Cup squad but could return to find himself replaced.

Chelsea owner Abramovich becomes Israeli citizen

JERUSALEM - Russian Jewish billionaire and Chelsea owner Roman Abramovich arrived in Israel on Monday after receiving citizenship of the Jewish state, local Channel 10 television reported.

"He landed today in his private aircraft at (Tel Aviv's) Ben Gurion airport and was presented with an Israeli identity card," the commercially-owned station said on its evening newscast.

An official at Nativ, a department of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's office dealing with Jewish communities in the ex-Soviet Union, said Abramovich had applied for an immigration visa at Israel's embassy in Moscow, the station said earlier on its website.

"His documents were examined under the 'Law of Return' and he was indeed entitled to immigrant status in Israel, and as a result he was issued an immigration visa," it added.

Spokesmen for Netanyahu's office contacted by AFP did not confirm or deny the report.

Israel's Law of Return gives every Jew, or child or grandchild of a Jew, the right to Israeli citizenship on demand.

According to media reports, Abramovich's British visa has run out and the application process for a new visa has been taking longer than usual.



ER SET FOR COMEBACK

MUNICH - Germany goalkeeper Manuel Neuer will make his comeback from a nine-month injury break in Saturday's international against Austria as he races to be fit for next month's World Cup, goalkeeping coach Andreas Koepke said on Tuesday.

World Cup winner Neuer, who has been the Germany number one for more than eight years, has not played a single official game since breaking a bone in his foot back in September but Koepke said he was fully on track for the tournament in Russia.

"That's the plan," Koepke told reporters at their training camp in Eppan, northern Italy.

Training

"As things stand now he will play on Saturday. There is nothing in the way and those are the matches he needs. An international against Austria where he will have more to do."

The 32-year-old Germany captain played 30 minutes in their training match against the German Under-20 team on Monday and will again play another 30 minutes when the two sides meet today.

Deadline

The reigning world champions will stay in Italy until June 5, a day after the deadline for the final 23-man squad announcement. Coach Joachim Loew has taken 27 players to the training camp with four facing the cut, including one of four keepers.

QATAR WORLD CUP BID VICTORY 'COMPLETELY ILLEGITIMATE'

LONDON - FIFA will come under renewed pressure to strip Oatar of the 2022 World Cup after a new watchdog uncovered more evidence of endemic corruption during the bidding process.

The Foundation for Sports Integrity, which will be launched in London tomorrow evening, say Qatar's vote victory in 2010 was 'completely illegitimate' in a new investigation. They claim to have evidence that Qatar paid millions to members of FIFA's executive committee as they considered which country to award the tournament to.

The findings, published by The Sun, include evidence that Argentine FIFA Executive Julio Grondona allegedly received a mystery payment of £3.6million into his Swiss bank account. The money was paid in just before the 2010 vote that determined which nations would stage the 2018 and 2022 World Cups. Qatar also allegedly paid off a £50m debt owed by the Argentine Football Association. The Foundation also reveal that a £1.1bn deal between Oatar Airways and French firm Airbus Industries followed talks between the Emir of Qatar, then-French President Nicolas Sarkozy and former UEFA President Michael Platini in the weeks leading u to the vote.

DESPITE THE TALENTS OF RONALDO, PORTUGAL ARE SWC OUTSIDERS

LISBON - Portugal head to the World Cup as European champions but few would place them among the favourites in Russia.

Cristiano Ronaldo will spearhead the charge but what about their coach, Fernando Santos, who led the team to glory only two years ago?

Here, we take a closer look at Santos and how Portugal are set for the tourna-

Santos enjoyed a decent, if unspectacular, playing career that was mostly spent with Estoril in the first, second and third tiers of Portuguese football. In management, he has coached in Portugal, with giants Benfica, Sporting Lisbon and Porto, and Greece, where he was in charge of AEK Athens, Panathinaikos and finally the Greek national team at Euro 2012. They made the quarter-finals before losing to Germany.

Some would say Santos is the antithesis of attractive, attacking football, with his teams usually set up to defend hist maintain shape and frustrate opponents through discipline and hard work. Under his leadership, Portugal won Euro 2016 scoring more than one goal in only two of their seven matches but who could argue with the result? His team won the country's first major tournament in its

The pair go back a long way, given Santos was in charge of Sporting when they sold Ronaldo to Manchester United in 2003. Ronaldo enjoys a close relationship with the 63-year-old, who named the striker as captain during the European Championship in France. Zinedine Zidane had led Real Madrid to Champions League

Lazio winger Nani and Lille striker Eder, who scored the winner against France in the Euro final, were also left disappointed.

Fekir helps France to comfortable win over Ireland

PARIS - Olivier Giroud and Nabil Fekir were on target as France stepped up their 2018 Soccer World Cup preparations by beating the Republic of Ireland 2-0 in Paris on Monday evening.

Chelsea striker Giroud bundled in the opener at the Stade de France, and Lyon captain Fekir - who has been linked with a move to Liverpool - got the second just before the break, with a helping hand from Ireland goalkeeper Colin Doyle.

It was a very comfortable victory for Didier Deschamps' side in the first of three friendly matches before they head to Russia.

Les Bleus will also host Italy in Nice on Friday and the United States in Lyon on June 9, with their opening World Cup fixture against Australia in Kazan on June 16.

"The game maybe didn't meet all my expectations, but we controlled it well, got the breakthrough before half-time and our movement was good, so there were plenty of good things to take from it," said Deschamps. France's strength in depth, showcased here on a night of torrential rain, thunder and lightning, means they are among the contenders to win the World Cup, 20 years after becoming world champions on home soil.

However, bigger tests lie in wait than that provided by Martin O'Neill's Ireland side.

The visitors started with seven players who turned out in the English Premier League this season, but they hardly got near the ball all evening.

France were not at full strength, with goalkeeper Hugo Lloris, Paul Pogba, N'Golo Kante and Antoine Griezmann starting on the bench. Raphael Varane has not yet joined up with the squad after winning the Champions League with Real Madrid at the weekend.

However, Deschamps handed a fifth cap to Benjamin Mendy, the Manchester City left-back who has hardly played since suffering a serious knee injury at the beginning of the campaign.

gy while the oranges are a good especially now that it is winter so they help the players from catching many winter infections," he added.

Mabuza added that the players do eat porridge but it is managed.

"They do eat pap but we manage how much they take in and they never say they are starving. We always tell them that this thing of being hungry also has a lot to do with the mind. Also, for breakfast, they eat a variety of things. They eat various cereals, juice and toasted bread. Our bread is always brown because brown bread is healthy. It has that important rough edge while white bread is mortified. So the brown bread helps the players' concentration levels "



hope that we will go into the Lesotho match in the right frame of mind," Mdluli concluded.





- Wanderers claim player has signed contract for 2018/19
- Weslians see no chance of player going to Swallows
- Kola has not signed with Wanderers agent
- Agent also confirms striker has penned three-month deal with 'Birds'

SOCCER - MANZINI Wanderers have come out guns blazing, saying that striker Kola Aledeon is still their player despite reports claiming that the forward has signed with MTN Premier League champions Mbabane Swallows.

A report carried in one of the country's daily newspapers yesterday claimed that Aledeon had joined Wanderers' rivals Swallows in a threemonth long deal to help the 'Birds' in their on-going CAF Champions League group stage campaign. Swallows are known to have a long standing admiration for the player whose initial contract with Wanderers was due to expire tomorrow.

However, the Weslians yesterday released a statement claiming that the Nigeria-born forward had signed a new one-year deal with them for the 2018/19 season.

"Aledeon Quadri Kola (whose initial contract ran up until May 31, 2018) has extended his contract for a further season with Manzini Wanderers FC. The player has signed for the 2018/2019 season and has been paid a signing on fee in line with the extension. Further, as stipulated in his 2017/2018 contract, the player has been provided with a return air ticket to enable him to travel back home to Nigeria for the holidays," reads part of the statement written by Sandile

Dlamini on behalf of Wanderers Directors. Wanderers added in the statement that they would only entertain offers from outside the country for their talismanic forward while effectively ruling out any possible future discussions over the player's transfer with Swallows. "Manzini Wanderers FC have an understanding with the player that in the event he gets an offer from a team outside the country, Manzini Wanderers will not stand in his way but will instead facilitate negotiations with an external team.

Mbabane Swallows has not approached Wanderers to discuss about acquiring the services of Kola for the period mentioned in today's newspaper report. Unfortunately, now that the air has already been poisoned by the disturbing newspaper report, the football club can confidently state that there's no

point now in such discussions ever taking place," the statement continued.



SOCCER- MANZINI Sundowns have rejected a E100 000 bid for winger Justice Figuareido from Mbabane Swallows.

Figuareido is hot property at the moment, with the youngster set for a 10-day assessment at South African top flight side Maritzburg United. Vesterday, the Swazi Observer reported that Sundowns had put a E600 000 price tag on the talented winger. Now, this publication understands

that Swallows tried to hijack Figuareido's proposed move to South Africa by tabling a E100 000 offer for him but Sundowns turned the bid down.

'Swallows officials met with Sundowns yesterday (Monday)and tabled a E100 000 offer. Sundowns turned them down and told Swallows to come back with a better offer

because they believe the player is worth way more. So it's up to Swallows now to up their offer," a source close to the matter told this publication yesterday.

Transfers

Reached for comment yesterday, Sundowns PRO Muzi Matsenjwa said transfers at the club were solely handled by Chairman Mark Carmichael but admitted that Figuareido was attracting a lot of interest from

other clubs.

"Nothing has reached my table on that specific issue you are talking about but transfers are directly handled by the chairman. The truth of the matter, however, is that many teams are interested in a lot of our players. We have received numerous offers for Figuareido because he is a good player, who has matured very well and is in his prime right now. However, we also want to state that we want to improve next season so we won't be selling our best players," Matsenjwa said.

Efforts to get a comment from Sundowns Chairman Carmichael proved unsuccessful as his mobile phone rang unanswered when contacted several times yesterday evening. The last attempt to reach him was made at 6.56pm.

Attempts to get a comment from Swallows General Manger Sandile 'Beyond 2000' Zwane also proved unsuccessful as his mobile phone rang unanswered for the better part of yesterday afternoon.
