

National Commissioner tasked with informing govt

rational Commissioner of Police Isaac Magagula was the person tasked by the Dlamini family to inform various government stakeholders about the demise of former Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini.

Magagula said his role in informing the powers that be was limited to his being a servant not as any authority. He was called after several close friends and relatives of the family passed the buck to others to confirm the demise of the states-man. This was in the early morning hours.

Initially Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane said his family should be contacted. He cautioned though that it would be a difficult

task to find anyone to confirm anything in the event the former PM was really deceased as it called for the family to meet first and appoint a spokesperson. He said he last saw

the former PM in his residence at Hospital Hill on Friday; "He was there yesterday, not necessarily at work, but in the residence and I saw him because my offices are

The former PM's son said he was not aware of anything while making his way to Hospital Hill.

His nephew Dr Vusi Magagula who is Director Health Services in the Ministry of Health said he was not aware of anything.

Of note, Magagula was in the United States when the call was made. The incidence was later confirmed by the former PM's sister Lomagugu Magagula.

Prior to that, the national commissioner stated that he was tasked with the painful task of informing the acting PM Vincent Mhlanga, Secretary to Cabinet Mbuso Dlamini as well the PS and Indvuna Lusendvo Fakudze.

GOVERNMENT'S STATEMENT

y early evening, government released a statement which summarised the demise of the former premier in 53 words.

"It is with regret that government announces to the Nation the passing away of former Prime Minister Dr Barnabas Sibusiso Dlamini.

He passed away last (Friday) night at Mkhiwa Clinic in Manzini where he was receiving treatment.

His Majesty's government and his family will keep the nation informed about funeral arrangements.

May his soul rest in peace."

ormer Prime Minister Sibusiso ◆ Dlamini's ex-brother in law expressed shock and disappointed about news of the former states man's demise.

"Hawu lo sbali wami," said Jabulani Maziva in shock. He stated that he was extremely saddened and was yet to process the news as he was informed by this reporter's call.

"I mourn his death because he never at any time did us any wrong," he said. Maziya was present during the ill-fated nuptials between his sister and former premier. On the day he was supportive and expressed his joy at the union.

When asked where his sister was following news that her former husband had died, he said she was in England and not aware of anything other than that she was employed there. "Am not aware of much about her. She is working. She is well and that is all I am aware of." Joy Maziya from Nkamanzi and Dlamini from Ntunja got engaged on December 28, 2013. Their whirl wind romance led to a high-profile wedding held at the Mavuso Trade and Exhibition Centre in Manzini which was held with all the pomp and fanfare on

They went on honeymoon to the Seychelles on March 16, leaving from King Mswati III International Airport.

They lived for some time at the Royal Villas in Ezulwini where the first crack to their union manifested itself when Joy left their residence in

the middle of the night wearing her night clothes. It was only at the intervention of his Private Personal Officer (PPO) Assistant Commissioner Paul Zishwili that the situation was abated. However, the volatile relationship led to the PM divorcing Joy on April 1, 2016, several months after they were estranged as she had moved back to her parental home in Nkamanzi. Immediately after the divorce was granted, she left the country for the United Kingdom.

KUKHANYENI NEIGHBOURS NOT AWARE OF EX-PM'S DEATH

espite that the death of former Prime Minister Sibusiso gripped the nation from as early as 7am yesterday, his neighbours at his home at Kukhanyeni said they were shocked to hear the news from this publication's reporters.

A handful of family members arrived at Kukhanyeni at about 15:40. Kukhanyeni is his marital home with first wife, Jane Matsebula.

A previous visit to the home on Thursday had a caretaker state that they had not seen the premier in three

This publication's news team visited the area for other matters and on passing by had a chat with the caretakers and lone police officer manning the

Yesterday nothing had changed as it was as quiet as on Thursday and neighbours said they were not aware of anything amiss.

When Muzi Dlamini, son to the late former PM arrived, he said he was not ready to engage the media.

He entered the homestead and instructed the police to inform reporters from this publication that he said, thanks, there was nothing he could

On the other hand, neighbours Sifiso and Mphendulo Dlamini said they were not aware that the former prime minister had passed on.

"We are shocked, we have not heard,

when did he die? There is nothing we can say save to send condolences," they said. Information gathered was that other media personnel had earlier visited the home.

Other neighbours said the former head of government frequently visited this home especially on weekends and on Sundays as he used to go to church. When the homestead at Ndzingeni was visited late in the afternoon, no one was found and the gate was locked. Even though it is was late in the afternoon,

some neighbours stated that they were not aware that Dlamini had passed on while a few said they had already learnt from the radio and were saddened by

They stated that the former PM rarely visited the homestead but maintained it as some people would occasionally be seen taking care of the yard.

Unlike at Kukhanyeni the neighbours said police were not guarding the home.

They also predicted that he may be laid to rest in that home.

DIES 24 DAYS AFTER EN OF TERM

ven though he has been indisposed for the last four months, ▲ former Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini died 24 days after his Cabinet which was acting as Sigejane was dissolved.

During his absence from active office, Dlamini was represented by former Deputy Prime Minister Paul Dlamini.

He got his last pay cheque as a prime minister a day before the secondary elections were held. This salary was

paid to all politicians from Bucopho, Indvuna Yenkhundla, Members of Parliament, senators to Cabinet ministers. New politicians could expect to be paid their first salaries in three weeks' time as their details are said to still be fed into the system.

20 September: He gets his last salary as Prime Minister.

04 September: Chairs Cabinet for the last time in his official capacity as

04 September: Sigejane is dissolved even though his deputy led it on his behalf.

20 June: The Parliament he led since October 28, 2013 is dissolved.

11 May: PM left for The Republic of China on Taiwan in the company of his wife Gugulethu Primrose Simelane. It was his second year spending his birthday, 15 May, in the Asian coun-

25 April: On National Flag Day,

then Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini fell ill while getting out of his bed and relatives said he hit his head awkwardly.

He was rushed to the Mbabane Government Hospital where he was admitted in the ICU and was attended by anaesthesiologist Dr Nimrod Matekere, who would frequently travel with him.

16-20 April: He attended and partook in the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting.

12 April: Leaves country for London to attend Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting where he represented His Majesty King Mswati III.

June 2017: Dlamini marries his third wife Gugulethu Primrose Simelane in an understated wedding in Matsapha

26 May 2017: Dlamini returns from The Republic of China on Taiwan after spending a month. He was treated for an undisclosed illness. He returned quietly as the media was not alerted, as usual, that he was coming back.

1 March 2017: PM leaves for South Africa for his annual medical checkup and stays there for three days.

the country's longest serving Prime Minister Dr. Sibusiso Barnabas Dlamini has died. Dlamini, aged 76, served 17 years as premier, through three full terms and

one in part. He succumbed to death on Friday night while admitted at Mkhiwa Clinic, where he was rushed to in the late

afternoon. His demise was confirmed by his elder sister, Lomagugu Magagula yesterday morning.

The ex-PM's death comes after a long fight against prostate cancer which saw him get medical attention on the

For over a year and a half, the ailment which saw him requiring several medical procedures, was not named as it remained in obscurity.

This diagnosis was confirmed by one of the several medical personnel who have attended to him in the last 18 months since he was said to have been first diagnosed in March 2017, albeit in confidence.

His last official day in Cabinet was April 9, when he returned from London where he had represented His Majesty King Mswati III during the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting.

According to close family members, he carried on working against his physician's better judgement as he was instructed to rest over a year prior to his last major medical scare which came about after a fall while in his bedroom at Hospital Hill.

Despite all odds, the former premier saw his last term in Cabinet to the end before bowing out.

He died a few hours after he was rushed to the hospital to be attended by specialist surgeon Dr Siamak Monadjem, the founder of the health facility

He was reappointed in October 2013 and led the 10th Parliament until he became indisposed.

He, however, carried on working, even though on the sidelines as Deputy Prime Minister Paul Dlamini acted on his behalf.

vive days before former Prime → Minister Dr Sibusiso Dlamini passed away, he was discharged from Netcare Milpark Hospital where he was admitted over two weeks ago.

This is the same medical centre where Winnie Madikizela-Mandela died early this year.

The former PM returned to the country on Sunday and he was deemed to be feeling a bit better as his appetite had returned. He was initially admitted at Mkhiwa Clinic in Manzini about three weeks ago after he was said to be weak as he was unable to eat due to lack of appetite.

From Mkhiwa Clinic, he was transferred to Milpark because his attending physician said he needed specialist care.

At Milpark, he was said to have waited for a Taiwanese doctor to arrive for observation and possible treatment. He was admitted in the intensive care unit.

He is said to have left the hospital sometime in the third week of this month and moved to a hotel, only to return to the hospital from where he was subsequently discharged, and he arrived at Hospital Hill on Sunday.

According to a close family member, he was better than when he initially left because he was able to eat, even though it was a laborious affair.

However, he was shaking and showing more short-term memory loss when speaking of things which happened recently. The memory loss was said to be as a result of the fall he sustained in April while in his bedroom in his official residence in Hospital Hill. He was rushed to Mkhiwa Clinic in Manzini on Friday afternoon and he passed away during the course of the night.

The time of death could not be immediately ascertained.

Family rushes to Hospital Hill

everal hours after the death of former Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini, immediate family members rushed to his residence at Hospital Hill.

The former PM has been in his residence despite vacating office over three weeks ago.

A call to his son, Muzi Dlamini, in the early morning revealed that he was on his way to the residence situated within Cabinet premises. "I am on my way home in Mbabane. I have not heard of anything," said Muzi, when he was called just before 9am.

He arrived at the residence a few minutes later in the company of his wife and left a few minutes thereafter in a different vehicle as a passenger.

He later returned and was driven in by a relative.

Other family members, including the former PM's sister, children and other relatives were later said to be there as well. Of note, a family member stated that there would be a meeting at his home in Ndzingeni where they would discuss further details pertaining their bereavement.



he former premier was great great grandson of Somhlolo, who was also known as King Sobhuza I.

His great great grandmother was Inkhosikati LaMndzebele who gave birth to his great grandfather, Somcuba also known as Ndlovuyangwane later became Prince Regent while King Mswati II was growing.

Prince Somcuba gave birth to his grandfather Mbhodziya who settled at kaNtunja and his senior wife LaMazibuko would later become Barnabas' grandmother. She bore Mantfwantfwa John who bore Barnabas.

Sibusiso Barnabas Dlamini was born May 15, 1942 to Mantfwantfwa John Dlamini who was a pastor and Elizabeth Dlamini. He was born at the Nazarene Mission Ndzingeni Clinic.

He was fourth born after Silas, Patricia Lomagugu and Amy Joyce. His sister Anna Gladness Siphiwe was born in 1944.

He went to school in 1948 at Hhelehhele and moved shortly thereafter to Havelock Nazarene School at Bulembu. He attended Ndzingeni Nazarene Primary School in 1952 as a resident boarder.

In 1956 he moved to Nazarene Secondary School and then proceeded to Franson Memorial Bible School where he matriculated.

He enrolled at Pius XII University College in Lesotho but he left before completing in 1962 and started teaching at Ndzingeni. In 1963 he applied and got a job as a water chemist at

Usuthu Pulp Company in Bhunya. He went on to be a power station operator at Edwaleni Hydro- Electric Project and left in 1966 to pursue his education at the University of Rochester in New York where he spent two semesters before going to Syracuse for the summer semester.

September 1967 saw him move to the University of Wisconsin for the continuation of his BSc course with intention to transition to medical school. After realising that it was too messy for his constitution, he transitioned towards industrial chemistry from which he graduated in 1969. He returned to the country and worked within the ministry of

agriculture research division.

He went on to teach at the Swaziland Agricultural College and University Centre which he left and went to work as an assistant chemist at the now defunct Ngwenya Iron Ore Mine, where he rose through the ranks and left as a metallurgical superintendent.

While working, he had enrolled at UNISA and was studying towards a Bachelor of Commerce degree which came in handy when he moved from SIODC. He joined Coopers and Lybrand which is now known as PricewaterhouseCoopers.

He initially went to Peat Marwick Mitchell which is present day KPMG where he learnt that clerks in Johannesburg earned E450 per month whereas locals were paid E350. Armed with this knowledge when he was asked of his expected salary, he brought up the figure he had heard and he got the salary and job.

In 1978 he was appointed to senate. In 1981 he enrolled for an MBA at the New York University Business School. Queen Regent LaThwala appointed him into the House of Assembly in 1983 and he formed his own accountancy firm BS Dlamini Chartered Accountants.

In 1984 he was appointed minister of finance after Dr Sishayi Nxumalo was relieved of his duties six month earlier while trying to reveal corruption within government. In 1992 he was nominated as Alternate to the Executive Director.

In 1996 he was appointed prime minister after Prince Mbilini. He served until 2003. He was reappointed in 2008 and again in 2013.

He died 24 days after finishing his last term.

TOO EARLY TO TALK OF EX-PM'S BENEFITS - GOVERNMENT

t is an inopportune time to talk of what will happen to former Prime Minister Sibusiso Dlamini's benefits.

Government Spokesperson Percy Simelane said the question on what will happen to his benefits was distasteful and not for him to delve into.

"I wouldn't like to be part of such a conversation," he said when asked to clarify on the meaning of the clauses of Finance Circular No 2 of 2013.

Page 17 of the Circular talks of the benefits and allowances payable to former PM and DPM.

"In an effort to maintain the dignity of Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister, this framework provides for the former prime minister and deputy prime minister certain benefits to assist them respond to post parliamentary life."

The circular states that they will

be eligible to benefits unless they hold an appointive or elective position in government, to which a rate of pay is attached.

Retirement

The former PM was supposed to start retirement and he was to be paid a pension and other pension benefits however, this comes to an end on his death.

PM would have, from next month onwards, been paid over E60 000 per month which is 80 per cent of his last pay which he received in September 20.

According to the circular, the house, which is popularly known as Lidlokolo and is being built in Gum Tree outside Manzini, remains seeing as money towards its construction has been paid out.

It remains to be seen if the Range Rover which was bought for the PM will be sold to his estate seeing as he never took possession of it.

He missed chance to vote

aving keenly registered for elections to the point of inviting members of the media, former prime minister Sibusiso Dlamini did not get to vote for his preferred candidate.

This is deduced from the fact that the former premier was indisposed

and admitted at Netcare Milpark Hospital in South Africa.

It could not be ascertained where he registered to vote, however, he could have possibly been registered in one of two places; that is in Ndzingeni or Kukhanyeni.

He has homes in both these areas.

Subsequent winners in the constituencies are Lutfo Dlamini for Ndzingeni whereas Sihlongonyane Vincent Malavi won a seat in Parliament for the Kukhanyeni Inkhundla.

The former premier indicated willingness to take part in the elections when he registered at the Mbabane

Municipal Council offices. The conclusion that he did not get to vote during the secondary elections is concluded seeing as he missed special voting as well as the actual day of voting which occurred two days

before he returned to the country after he was discharged .

However, when a follow-up call was made, his phone rang unanswered. His former Deputy Speaker Esther Dlamini's phone was not reachable.

Former Manzini North MP Jan Sithole said he was out of the country so he had not heard about the sad news.

Efforts to discuss the PM's death with former Minister of Public Works & Transport Pastor Lindiwe Dlamini were unsuccessful as her phone rang unanswered. Also contacted was the ex-Minister of Labour and Social Security Winnie Magagula but her phone was engaged every time a call was made.

Speaker of the 8th and 9th Parliament Prince Guduza was also unreachable on his Swazi MTN cellphone number.

Former PM Dr Absalom Themba Dlamini's phone rang unanswered when contacted late yesterday while Shiselweni Regional Administrator and former DPM Themba Masuku was also not reachable.

LATE EX-PM WAS AN ENCYCLOPAEDIA - EX-MP THULI

NDZINGENI RESIDENTS PROTEST LUTFO'S ELECTION VICTORY

...Clueless that former Prime Minister had passed away

bout 100 residents of Ndzingeni yesterday protested at the inkhundla over the election of Member of Parliament Lutfo Dlamini in the recently ended elections.

The protest took place just metres away from former Prime Minister Dr Sibusiso Dlamini's parental homestead, with the residents completely oblivious of what had happened. Dlamini died on Friday night at

Mkhiwa Clinic in Manzini. After news of Dlamini's death started circulating, this publication visited his parental area for reactions

from the residents. However, reporters came across a small protest that was carefully guarded by a large but silent police

When asked what the protest was about, the residents who were singing songs of freedom, said the recent secondary elections were mismanaged by the Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC).

The protesters alleged that local favourite for Ndzingeni Member of Parliament (MP) Mbongeni 'Stjifiri' Gule was cheated by the EBC who

added 298 'ghost' votes in favour of new Ndzingeni MP Lutfo Dlamini.

The protesters were pictured marching up and down the main gravel road at Ndzingeni, eventually stopping at the Ndzingeni inkhundla gate that was locked and secured by

Speaking to this publication, most of the protesters said they did not know that Dlamini had passed away and were shocked by the news.

The protesters said they were interested in speaking to the EBC offi-

cials who cheated the Ndzingeni community using 'ghost' votes.

"To be very honest with you we do feel bad that Dlamini has passed away and we hope that this time it is not a hoax because in recent times rumours of Dlamini's death have been circulating constantly on social

As residents of Ndzingeni we did not see the late premier too often so it would be very hard to comment on his death at this point in time. It's unfortunate we are in the middle of a protest against the 2018

This protest has taken most of our time over the last two days," said one of the residents. The protesters went on to say Ndzingeni has a known number of residents who voted for Gule and not for the eventual winner Dlamini. "Ndzingeni has close to 7 000 residents divided into nine chiefdoms. These chiefdoms have a certain number of individuals who mostly voted for Gule. So, how did Dlamini win the elections by 298 votes? These are ghost votes as nobody actually voted using those ballots. We want the EBC to explain where the ghost votes came from. If the EBC is innocent they should come here to speak to us? Yesterday (Friday) high ranking police officials promised us that today (Saturday) we will get a visit from the EBC but this has not happened, instead the Pigg's Peak Station Commander Webster Methula came here. He has asked us to revisit our protest on Monday. I hear you speak about the late prime minister's death but currently we cannot comment," added another.

When asked to comment about the protest, EBC Communications Officer Mbongiseni Bhembe repeated his last statement, saying he welcomed the protestors to register their complaints with evidence to the EBC head office as the EBC has an open door policy, which allows people to be free to raise their queries.

MASWATI CHALL AU MISSION ON FREI ECTIONS DECLARATIO

ome Emaswati have challenged the African Union election observers on their report which indicated that the recent Eswatini elections were peaceful and professional.

Speaking during a press conference convened by the AU mission last week Saturday to present its preliminary statement, some Emaswati wondered why the AU had recommended for Eswatini to allow political parties in the next election yet this was not followed up.

The mission was led by His Excellency James Alix Michel, former President of Seychelles and comprised 30 short-term observers (STOs) representing a total of 17 AU member states.

Soon after Michel had finished delivering the statement, he opened the floor for questions and comments from those who attended the press conference.

Former Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) President Sibongile Mazibuko wondered why AU would come to the country and declare the elections legitimate when the mission had observed as noted in their report that the elections were not held in accordance with the provisions of the African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance.

'When we saw you arriving, we said 'oh Africa is here', finally they will see the predicament we are facing, lo and behold we discovered that it is not so.

In fact, we expect observer mission not to come at all if minimum standards are not met.

We wonder why Africa should come here to legitimise an election which is illegitimate. We expect Africa to assist us," she said.

Siphephile Kunene from the SABC News asked if the AU considered the elections as undemocratic considering that they were held while political parties were still banned. Responding to the question the leader of the mission said they had made a recommendation directed at her question.

"The elections were held in accordance to the electoral laws of the country and we are making our recommendations as clear as this question to be considered by the authorities of the country," he said.

Human Rights Lawyer Thulani Maseko said he realised that the recommenda...they want to know why the call to unban political parties had not been followed up after it was also recommended in previous elections.

tions were not so much different from those of the past election with respect to the ban of political parties and wanted to know if the AU was going to engage with the King, so he may engage in dialogue with those advocating for multi-party democracy.

"We hear a lot about Africa trying to find solutions to African problems using African solutions. Now, I just want to know, whether we can expect the AU having observed the elections will engage in a process, where they can engage with the government to come to the table with those advocating for political parties," he asked.

Michel said the mission will deliver its detailed report to the AU Commission and the report will be debated, taken up and considered by the AU heads of states in the General Assembly. The African Union election observers and local progressives had urged Eswatini authorities to lift the ban on political parties and allow them to freely participate in elections.

Just like in the past, the mission said the country should consider reviewing the 1973 decree and promised that the matter will be on the agenda in the next

According to reports several social movements and trade unions called for the repeal of the King's declaration, which was passed in 1973 as they argued that it "outlawed political parties, dissolved Parliament and placed legislative, executive and judicial powers in the hands of the King"

The key objective of the African Union Election Observer Mission (AUEOM) is to make an independent, objective and impartial assessment of the conduct of the General Elections held on September 21 and proffer recommendations for the improvement of future elections in the Kingdom of Eswatini.

During the press conference, the AUEOM presented a summary of its key observations and findings of the electoral process. One of the key findings and recommendations of the AUEOM that was deliberated extensively was with regards to the political context; this is that of the continuous exclusion of political parties in the nation-

RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on its observations and consultations, the mission:

 Applauds the Kingdom of Eswatini for signing the African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance on January 29, 2008 and further implores the Kingdom to consider ratifying, domesticating and implementing the

 Encourages the Eswatini authorities to consider reviewing the 1973 decree, which dissolved and prohibited all political parties and similar bodies in Eswatini and allow parties to freely participate in the electoral process in accordance with provisions of the African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance.

 Urges the Eswatini authorities to consider entrenching the principle of separation of powers between the Executive, Legislature and Judiciary in accordance with the 2007 African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance.

 Urges electoral stakeholders to consider reviewing the electoral system to enhance inclusivity and foster participation of marginalised groups such as youth and people with disabilities.

• Urges the government of Eswatini to ensure that the Electoral and Boundaries Commission is adequately resourced to carry out its mandate effectively and efficiently.

 While applauding relevant electoral stakeholders for ensuring that a large number of women participate in the electoral process as polling staff and voters, it encourages them to promote women's participation and gender equality in elected offices.

 Urges the EBC to consider counting of ballots at polling stations immediately after voting to enhance efficiency, transparency and integrity of the process.

 Implores all electoral stakeholders to embark on comprehensive and continuous voter and civic education.

 Applauds the EBC for providing transportation for voters to polling stations. However, the Commission is encouraged to consider increasing the number of polling stations, especially in rural areas where the distances between the stations are too long.

 Encourages candidate agents and citizen observers to enhance their participation throughout all the stages of the electoral process.

"As was in the past elections, the 2018 elections took place within an environment that does not officially recognise the formation and operation of political parties in Eswatini. The elections were conducted in line with Section 79 of the 2005 Constitution, which emphasises individual merit as the basis for election or appointment to public

"The Constitution seeks to incorporate and guarantee fundamental rights and freedoms of the individual in line with international and regional norms of democratic governance. According to the 2005 Constitution, the executive reigns supreme over the other arms of government (the Judiciary and the Legislature) with the King as the highest authority," concluded the mission.

For this reason, the mission urged the

country's authorities to unban political parties and allow them to participate in the next elections.

"Based on its observations and consultations, the Mission: encourages the Eswatini authorities to consider reviewing the 1973 decree, which dissolved and prohibited all political parties and similar bodies in Eswatini and allow parties to freely participate in the electoral process in accordance with provisions of the African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance," said AU Mission Head James Michel.

The mission further urged the Eswatini authorities to consider entrenching the principle of separation of powers between the Executive, Legislature and Judiciary in accordance with the 2007 African Charter on Democracy, Elections and Governance.

KEY FINDINGS

 The electoral process was conducted in a generally calm and peaceful environment. However, stakeholders consulted briefed the mission about a wage-related workers' strike prior to Election Day. The protests intensified in Manzini leading to police intervention. By Election Day, the strike action had ended.

• The legal framework within which the 2018 elections were conducted remains largely unchanged since the 2013 elections. The 2005 Constitution guarantees fundamental rights and freedoms such as freedom of association, assembly and expression. However, electoral stakeholders informed the mission that practical restrictions on civil and political rights remain. These relate to, among others, to the formation and participation of political parties in the electoral process.

●The Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) conducted both the primary and secondary level elections in a generally well-organised, professional and timely manner despite some budgetary constraints. However, the closing of polling stations and transportation of ballots to central counting centres has the potential to compromise the security of the ballot as well as transparency and credibility of the counting process.

● The Constitution and legal framework seeks to enhance women's political participation in the electoral processes through the provision of quotas. The electoral stakeholders consulted by the mission raised a concern that few women were nominated as candidates in both the primary and secondary elections.

CONCLUSION

he 2018 General Elections in the Kingdom of Eswatini were conducted in a peaceful environment.

The EBC administered the election in a professional manner, despite the challenges observed by the mission, especially during closing and counting stages of the electoral process.

The mission extends its profound gratitude to all Eswatini electoral stakeholders and voters for participating in the electoral process with enthusiasm and in a peaceful manner.

he mystery surrounding the alleged disappearance of locally-born South Africa based socialite is not over; not by a long


Sakhile 'Oros' Msibi might have called his friends and family, assured them that he was fine about 10 days ago, however; he remains in the missing category on Interpol.

His name and face remain on a Yellow Notice.

His father is adamant, seeing him on video call is not enough and hence he is working with the police to find

He wants to not only know where he is, but to see him physically before calling off the search for the man who has been missing since April. He counts April as the time he went missing simply because that was the last time they communicated freely.

planned and would instead stick around the country for the 50/50 celebrations.

Officially, Oros disappeared on May 1 when he posted on Instagram about going to Abu Dhabi. Sipho Msibi says he will only accept the police's version of events seeing as his son seems unable to reveal his location as conversations

with him sounded stifled and cagey. "We will not rely on what is being said by the media. We reported the case to the police and we think they are the ones who are supposed to let us know of their investigations and

Msibi senior says it would only be after seeing him physically that they would be satisfied and find closure.

n the over 24 hours of constant social media activity over a week ago, Sakhile 'Oros' Msibi gave two versions pertaining his disappearance.

One version he told his parents, the other to a lifelong friend.

According to his parents, Oros said he was involved in an accident which made him unable to call them as he was in a coma for most of five months. This puzzled them because he appeared healthy during the video call scheduled for 7pm on a Thursday, which was said to be six hours ahead of local time. He also told them he would never return to the country. On the other hand, a friend who preferred anonymity, said Oros' version was that he was arrested for being gay in Abu Dhabi and was disappointed that despite being so high profile, no one came to his res-

"He blames government and is not happy as he says more could have been done to rescue him," said the friend, who said she was taking this bit of information with a pinch of

She stated that he also talked about making a documentary of his life

which she said was also a bit sketchy seeing as he was not telling his clique about what happened.

"We are leaving the Msibis to deal with this now," said a male friend. He stated that they were also perplexed but could not bring themselves up to question that which they cannot decipher.

All friends interviewed said they would only embrace whatever he says the day they see him as there was something cagey about the way he spoke as he did not want to be questioned about the last five months.

Use of his passport could trigger Interpol search

akhile 'Oros' Msibi is on Interpol's States. Yellow Notice.

According to the institution's website, yellow notices are a valuable law enforcement tool that can increase the chances of a missing person being located, particularly if there is a possibility that the person might travel, or be taken, abroad.

This is contrary to Oros' alleged version to his friends concerning his purported arrest in Abu Dhabi and subsequent post about being in the United

The website states that such a notice is a global alert to help locate missing persons, or to identify persons who are unable to identify themselves.

"Yellow Notices are published for victims of parental abductions, criminal abductions (kidnappings) or unexplained disappearances," reads the web-

Further, it said it gives high, international visibility to cases as abducted or missing persons are flagged to border officials, making travel difficult.

EBC OFFICIALS STILL DRIVING RENTED CARS

lections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) officials continue to be spotted driving in the rented vehicles.

Secondary national elections were held last weekend, which marked the end of the elections. However, yesterday, there were by-elections at Mbabane West Inkhundla for Indvuna Yenkhundla.

Another remaining event would be that of Mbangave community under Mhlambanyatsi Inkhundla, where they have to re-elect a new Bucopho after the death of newly-elected Maphevu Zwane. However, many of the rented cars from a South African company are still in the country. Most of them are seen moving up and down on a daily basis while some are parked at the Police Academy in Matsapha.

The rented cars are estimated to be over 300, which excludes 500 kombis rented from the Local Kombis Association. Explaining why the cars are still being seen on the streets and not returned to South Africa, Elections

and Boundaries Commission (EBC) Chairman Chief Gija said some of the cars were already back with the EBC. Chief Gija explained that some were

returned on Wednesday and others on Friday.

He stated, however, that some of the officials were still winding up their work. The chairman further noted that on-going court cases pertaining elections were also causing a delay. He caid this was because the officials have

to do follow-ups on the cases. "We will have few cars in possession of the officials because of the on-going cases," the chief said. He predicted that by tomorrow, all rented cars would have been returned to EBC. When asked to disclose in percentages the number of cars that have been returned to EBC, he said he was not at liberty to discuss that aspect and referred all questions to the EBC Head of Secretariat Richard Phungwayo.

However, he estimated that about 70 per cent of the cars were supposed to be with the EBC by now.

He noted that if the secretariat finds its befitting, the remaining elections related cases may be managed with local cars. He said such finer details can be obtained from the secretariat.

However, efforts to discuss the matter with the secretariat were unsuccessful as Phungwayo was not available to comment.

On the other hand, EBC's Communications Officer Mbonisi Bhembe, when asked to address the matter, said he needed to consult with the transport department. However, he made it clear that he would not be able to give responses either Friday or yesterday. He said this was because yesterday he was tasked to monitor the Mbabane West by-elections for Indvuna Yenkhundla. The rented cars involve; double cab 4x4 Toyota, Isuzu, Ford, Hyundai and Quantums. Most of the car rental companies usually charge according to mileage and the number of days. The fixed charge for a day usually ranges from E350 to 500. However, when rented for a long period, it is commonly cheaper, this is because lesser figure is negotiated based on the quantity and time frame.

The vehicles have been in the country for almost four months as elections registration started in May to July, after it was extended by 11 days.





CHURCH MEMBER POISONS DECEAS

he family of deceased Mbangave Bucopho winner Maphevu Zwane (34) has alleged that their son was poisoned by a fellow church member where he (Maphevu) was a pastor.

The sudden demise of Maphevu came two weeks after he won the elections to be Bucopho of M'angave under Mhlambanyatsi Inkhundla. This would have been his third term as bucopho of Mbangave.

He was also a pastor at Canaan Apostle Church in Zion. This publication visited the homestead on Wednesday afternoon, where the deceased's mother, Mgcibelo Zwane said the suspect poisoned Mapheva during a prayer service at the deceased's homestead. The prayer service was for Mapheve after he had fallen sick a few days atter winning elections. The church member who poisoned

Maphevu was also part of congregates who had come to pray for the sickly Maphevu.

As the service was nearing its end,

the church member together with a few family relatives prepared tea for the worshipers.

Make Zwane said when Maphevu's

wife went outside the house to attend a car in the yard which was coming with groceries. The suspected woman quickly served the deceased with the poisoned tea.

On her return, the wife was stunned to find her husband drinking tea which had been prepared by the woman. "Sisesontfweni tsinenaye (We go to the same church with the woman)," she said. Zwane said until they got to the hospital, they were not aware that he had been poisoned.

The doctor is said to have informed the family that his organs had been badly damaged. These organs included the heart, lungs and he had a big hole in the intestines. Some organs had sores. She went on to state that their suspicions were aggravated and confirmed by the fact that none of the other church member's had visited them to pass condolences on the demise of Maphevu.

Mgcibelo said soon after being nominated for the elections, her son started receiving death threats from supporters of one of the bucopho candidates, who had crashed out of the

She said some of the people made it clear that even after winning Mapheva would not live to assume his office. As per the death threats, soon after winning, Maphevu fell sick. The family assumed that it was just a minor sickness and hoped he would get better. "What hurts us the most is that the threats were to the effect that my son would never assume his office term and indeed the threats had now become a reality," Zwane lamented. She went on to state that the family as a whole has been left devastated by the death of Maphevu. She said this has resulted in the family developing hatred for the community.

She said the community should not have elected Maphevu to the position if they were not satisfied with his performance in the previous term of

Maphevu is survived by his wife and four children, two boys and two girls. Before his untimely death he was preparing to have a traditional wedding as he had paid lobola.

Maphevu was buried today and his burial was delayed by the fact that his wife did not have a teka certificate. However, on Wednesday, Zwane said the family members were able to get

A resident speaking on condition of anonymity for fear of victimisation said most residents of the area would borrow money from the deceased and he would give without complaining.

The old man added that if he was a shylock Maphevu would have died a filthy rich person as he would accumulate more wealth from

On the other hand, Maphevu's mother Mgcibelo said her son was the most generous child out of all her eight children. She said none of his children even come close to the demised.

"They have killed the community at large as many people benefited from his goodwill," she

The mother added that her son also assisted some members of the community to get jobs. At home, the mother said Maphevu was of great assistance as he was a breadwinner.

When asked about this, Khumalo refuted that the act was not enforceable as the date was clear for those who familiarised themselves with the piece of legislation.

Present during the commission were Judge Maxine LaNgwenya, Principal Magistrate Fikile Nhlabatsi, Manzini Acting Senior Magistrate Sindisiwe Zwane as well as several lawyers, students and the candidates.

When quizzed about the Act and the contention on the date last week Thursday, Principal Magistrate Nhlabatsi said she took note of the issue and checked after the meeting, only to find that there was no anomaly in the gazette. Other than the mishap with the SODV Act gazette, women were taught about the needs for legislations and policies such as the need for a legal aid act which will see the disenfranchised afforded adequate legal representa-

They were called up to look into the administration of Estates Act, the review of the Marriage Act which needs change in the status of minority and grounds for divorce. The Elections Act of 2013 was said to need review and amendment because the 30 per cent female representation was behind the 50 per cent requirement by SADC protocols. Within this amendment, women called for only increased representation of other marginalised groups as they stated that there was need for proportional representation of disabled people. Women were called to lobby for the codification of customary and traditional law as this will help with it be aligned to the Constitution which makes any law which goes against it null and void.

Women were also mandated to lobby against injustices such as marital rape which is hidden within conjugal rights as well as a realistic approach to the need for abortion to be allowed without the sanctimonious look at it being

Women need to revive education - Dr Kunene

niversity of Eswatini Lecturer Dr Sithembile Kunene challenged women who are headed for Parliament to revive the education sector.

The St. Theresa's Schools' product, and now grantee, said it was disheartening to live to see the degradation of the education sector come about in her time whereas years ago it was one to be reckoned with. She decried that there was a lot amiss which was going unchecked such as the implementation of the Free Primary Education (FPE) grant.

She said it was disappointing that instead of subsidising education for those who can afford, making it free for those who couldn't, a glaring compromise was being made and as a result deterioration of the system occurred. She recalled how her basic education locally enabled her to compete better in international tertiary institutions. "The current economic crisis does not allow for government to take up such a burden completely, however, it penalises principals who are burdened by the stress of managing schools without enough funds." She stated that there was also need for recognition that some subjects were cumbersome to teach. Subjects such as science need time as well as nurturing from teachers to pupils and hence the need to pay those teachers dedicated to teaching sciences an allowance which will motivate them to stay within the profession.

JUDGE QINISILE DECRIES MALE DOMINATION IN LEADERSHIP POSITIONS

rincipal Judge Qinisile Mabuza has noted that most decision-making positions in the country are occupied by men.

Of note, the Judge's statement comes in a time when the country is fresh from the recent polls, where only two women were elected into the positions of Member of Parliament (MPs).

His Majesty King Mswati III is expected to appoint the country's new Prime Minister. (PM) and there have been growing calls that the country is ready for a female PM.

Judge Mabuza said despite the domestication of many international instruments such as the Beijing Conference of 1995 and CEDAW by promulgating statues and policies affecting women, it was regrettable the current proportion of women in leadership positions.

She was speaking on Thursday during the Co-ordinating Assembly of Non-Governmental Organisations' (CANGO) 36th Annual General Meeting (AGM) held at Happy Valley Hotel, Ezulwini.

Over 30 NGOs attended the AGM which was themed: "The Role of NGOs in Promoting Women in Decision Making.'

"The Constitution Act was passed during 2005 with an entrenched Bill of Rights.

The Constitution set a target of 30 per cent women in Parliament, while the SADC Protocol on Gender and Development that the country ratified in September 2012 stipulated a target of 50 per cent by 2015.

It is sadly notable that in spite of all these initiatives, progress remains very slow," Mabuza

She went on to state that it was regrettable that leadership positions continue to be dominated by men in both public and private spheres in our beautiful kingdom and yet women make up 51 per cent of the total population according to the 2017 Eswatini Population and Housing census.

For example, there has been a notable decline in the representation of women in the August and esteemed House of Parliament.

"This trend has continued in Cabinet and in the appointment of principal secretaries and ambassadors," she noted.

Positions

Judge Mabuza said so long as women are not in decision-making positions, the country is in a 'tremendous loss of experience and expertise' because women cannot make input into the development of the country.

She also said the failure to utilise women in decision-making implies that they cannot decide on issues that affect the country.

She pointed out that this failure has negative repercussions on their advancement as women and to contributing to the journey to vision 2022 and agenda 2030 of the Sustainable Development Goals.


"Whilst forming the majority in the country women are missing in decision-making structures in many spheres of our society. Even where they occupy such positions, they do not have power to make any decisions. It is their male bosses who make all the deci-

The women end up being merely tokens of the female gender species," she elaborated.

In her presentation, the principal judge noted that within traditional structures, local and national political spheres (councillors, MPs, Cabinet, government boards) and private sectors, do not have equal representation of women into decision-making positions including board of directors and CEOs.

She added that even when they are members of boards, women are in the minority and their appointments is merely to fulfil lipservice and not because they are in reality meant to be decision-makers.

"The minority of women in such spaces reenforces the perception of gender discrimination and gender inequality, even though the right to equality is guaranteed in the Bill of Rights in our Constitution, Section 20 provides for equality before the law," she said.



Principal Judge calls for women empowerment from NGOs

rincipal Judge Qinisile Mabuza has urged NGOs to empower women in an effort to increase participation in decision-making.

She said the Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) should continue the empowerment of women given their unique fluid position in society from grassroots and across other sectors and dimensions.

"In order to make gender equality and equity a reality, NGOs must continue their constant and unwavering fights to secure women's rights in all walks of life such as social political educational, economic, households and religious communities," Judge Mabuza said.

The honourable Judge urged NGOs to adopt internal women participation in decision-making policies; to generate evidence-based advocacy by collecting and sharing data on reasons of the lack of women in decision making positions; conduct more civic education programmes on promoting women participation with the aim of behaviour-change and women's right consciousness; periodically publish a woman in development barometer where all sectors can be included to report status and measure of progress and; to embark on leadership training and capacity building programmes targeting women in various sectors of society especially young women.

She said unless positive changes in all these fronts are achieved in a balanced and holistic manner women empowerment will be elusive. NGOs have the capacity to be the conduit for change in all these fronts.

LRIVER BLOCKS WOMEN - REV. ABSALOM PSYCHOLOGICAI

everend Absalom Dlamini stated that the trend in absence of women in decision-making was witnessed internationally but had merely resulted in quota systems which many are still battling to achieve.

"Women have been mobilised and sensitised from grassroot level, but again there seems to be a psychological river that is impassable by our women.

workshops and training have been sponsored and conducted but the out-come is still disappointing," he said.

Dlamini said he comes from the NGOs sector where women, including former Maphalaleni Member of Parliament (MP) Lomasotfo Martha Dludlu, at the time had immensely contributed to national building. He said this shows the critical role

women can play in similar positions with men which unfortunately was

ever on the decrease.

Revered Dlamini added that in the past, there had been a number of women in decision-making positions rising from the notion of patriarchy and tradition.

However, with more women educated and liberated than before, there were still strong norms instilling fear in women to take up leadership positions which need to be dismantled.

Dlamini said there was a need for the literal pushing of women into decision-making positions and voice in order for the country to realise gender equality.

Dludlu was the first elected woman MP in the Kingdom, representing her Maphalaleni Constituency from 1993 to 1998.

Though with basic education, she was able to move motions on issues affecting women and her community in Parliament for the benefit of her constituency. She was, howev-

er, a lone voice and disadvantaged in seeing things change expediently for many women. "She understood her role as a constituency representative and a legislator," he said.

He attributed the regress in the number of women in decision-making positions to the lack of strategies. He said the representation of women in decision-making positions must be looked at and attended to with more focused approach at the NGO level.

"The legislature must fully support the implementation of quotas for women appointment to decisionmaking according to international agreements.

This means providing an enabling legal framework for women inclusion in decision-making," Dlamini stated. He said there must be a deliberate move by lawmakers and everyone everywhere to make sure that these quotas are fulfilled.

RENTAL HIKE BITES AS 22 MOBENI FLATS LEFT VACANT

he Swaziland National Housing Board (SNHB) has noted with dismay that the Matsapha Estate has been slow in attracting new tenants since April.

This comes after 22 flats were left vacant recently by occupants, according to SNHB Public Relations Officer, Zamancele Mavuso.

Mavuso said the Matsapha Estate was currently 96 per cent occupied, which means that 22 flats were vacant.

Meanwhile, the Mbabane Estate is 100 per cent occupied which means currently there are no vacant flats.

Unverified reports that have been circulating are that the flats became vacant after rental increase in April. Explaining why the flats were vacant, especially in Matsapha, Mavuso said

tenants vacated the flats for a number of reasons, month after month.

Analysis

"In our analysis, we learnt that the major reasons for vacating are tenant moving into his/her own house, rental rates and tenant relocating due to change of jobs or work station,"

she said.

However, she added that SNHB noted that after the notification of rental increase was circulated in March 2018, a number of tenants gave notice to vacate both in Mbabane and in Matsapha.

This resulted in seven tenants in

Mbabane and eight in Matsapha who vacated their occupation in the first month

Mavuso went on to mention that the rate in which the units are reoccupied differs per location. The units in Mbabane were quickly fully occupied by other tenants who were on the waiting list whereas the Matsapha Estate has been slow to attract new tenants.

Increase

She alleged that some tenants who had originally vacated after the rent increase was effected, had returned to the Mobeni Estate due to unsatisfactory circumstances experienced with other landlords.

The SNHB spokeswoman added that when the rental was increased by 15 per cent in April 2018, units like the Old Mobeni flat rental rates increased from E1 315 to E1 510, marking an increment of E195.

When asked if the flats were still affordable to ordinary Emaswati considering the country's economic status, she responded to the affirmative. Mavuso pointed out that SNHB constantly tries to ensure that rental prices are kept at reasonable rates.

"SNHB currently offers two-bedroom units situated in urban areas, well maintained and secure at rates as low as E1 510.

This is considered very reasonable in comparison to other offerings by different real estate businesses where bedsitter units can cost as much as E2 500," the mouthpiece explained.

She further stated that it was the Housing Board's wish that rental rates be kept as low as possible.

Mavuso said, unfortunately, the need to increase was necessitated by variables like maintenance costs, security services, insurance and human resources, which are all procured at market rate by the Board.

"In principle, SNHB units are 'social housing' and should be subsidised by government to redress the disparity between the controlled rental imposed by government and operational expenses that the Board is exposed to in running the business. It is for this reason that SNHB continues to engage government on the issue of rent subsidy," she elaborated.

She said the cost of maintenance for the units is very high and continues to increase rapidly each year, mostly due to the fact that the units are over 30 years old. The spokeswoman stated that in as much as the country's economic status is unfavourable, it would not make sense for the Board to offer minimum rental rates but fail to ensure an upkeep of the environment that Emaswati call home because it is unable to cater for the operational costs.

NAWUSHI WANTS NATCOM TO ACCOUNT FOR POLICE BRUTALITY

he National and Allied Workers Union in Swaziland Higher Institutions (NAWUSHI) wants to see the National Commissioner of Police, Isaac Magagula held accountable for police brutal assault on workers.

During the Trade Union Congress of Swaziland (TUCOSWA) strike action last Tuesday, seven workers were reportedly brutally assaulted by the police during a clash in Manzini.

One of the unionists injured was NAWUSHI's trustee Fana Mabuza.

NAWUSHI released a statement condemning the police brutality on civil servants during the recent protest action.

"NAWUSHI will explore all possible legal avenues of the law to hold the Police Commissioner Isaac Magagula accountable for the violent and reckless actions of his troops to our trustee unionist Mabuza," NAWUSHI General Secretary Fundizwi Sikhondze said a statement.

Having condemned the violence against unarmed protesters, NAWUSHI said the organisation was resolute in

support of the public sector workers in Eswatini (including parastatal workers), who deserve their cost of living.

He added that the workers cannot be made to bear the brunt of the country's economic slowdown alone.

NAWUSHI further calls upon government to, without further delay, accede to the other demands by TUCOSWA such as to reinstate severance pay in labour legislation, introduction of E3 500 minimum wage, for

Eswatini Electricity Company (EEC) to bring down the electricity tariffs and the amendment of the Public Enterprises Act 1989, amongst other demands.

Action

"Failure to accede to these demands can only lead to rolling mass action and a total shutdown of the economy until the demands are met," Sikhondze said.

He said Mabuza was brutally assault-

ed with batons by more than a dozen heavily armed police officers, while clearly walking away from the police, irantically protecting his face and body against the blows.

"From the video footage that has been widely circulated on social networks, it is clear that he eventually fell from the sheer brutality of the beatings.

Even as he haplessly laid on the pavement, defeated and bleeding from his injuries in the face and his nose having been left with gaping slit, the police continued to mercilessly assault him with batons and stomping him with their boots," Sikhondze said.

and the state of the control of the

NAWUSHI further notes that Mabuza was not the only worker who was brutally attacked by the police and admitted to hospital.

He pointed out that several workers from different sectors, including the public sector and those from the industrial sector, were injured from beatings and from being hit by shrapnel from police stun grenades.

He noted that one particular case that stands out is the case of the self-employed worker who was just walking in the streets (not even wearing trade union gear) to buy stock for his roadside market business when police pounced on him and beat him near unconsciousness. Unfortunately, the self-employed worker was the most critically injured and had a gaping wound on his head. However, he is said to have responded well to treatment at the hospital.

"NAWUSHI stands in solidarity with those injured and wish them speedy recovery from their injuries," Sikhondze stated

The union also condemned not only the police who meted the severe punishment to workers but also those who issued the directive that the workers who were exercising their right to protest be beaten.





f you've ever been a landlord, you know that setting up a tenancy isn't eas. From preparing your property to having a tenant move n, it's a process that can take a long time and includes many important steps.

Once your property is ready and the tenants have been found, all that stands between you and getting that first month's rent in the bank is some paperwork.

According to many legal and professional experts, it seems like a large percentage of landlords' woes are to some degree self-inflicted: even if it's the tenant being troublesome, the situation would be much easier to deal with if the landlord had set everything up correctly in the first place.

WHAT IS A TENANCY?

A tenancy is automatically created whenever somebody moves into a property and starts paying rent. Even if there's no paperwork at all, the occupant still becomes a tenant, which means they have certain legal rights that are difficult to remove.

Even though a tenancy is created automatically, you should still have a written tenancy agreement, also known as a lease.

The landlord will be identified as the lessor, and your tenant will become the lessee. Without one, there's no evidence about when the tenant moved in, how much rent they should be paying, or anything else.


All disputes come down to hesaid/she-said, and it will be very difficult to get help from the courts if you need it.

A good tenancy agreement is useful for many reasons.

Firstly, it clearly sets out what's expected of both parties.

It provides the correct legal footing to start, maintain and end the tenancy, and it serves as a reference throughout the tenancy to see what should happen in certain situations. While it's possible to cram an entire tenancy agreement onto a single page, a good tenancy agreement can easily run to 10 or more pages, depend-

ing on the type of property you're renting out.

It goes into everything the tenant and landlord should and shouldn't do. That way, whatever situation crops up, both parties can turn to the tenancy agreement to see what's been agreed.

The best way to have lease drawn up is to consult with a lawyer and have them write it out for you. You can find tenancy agreements floating around on the internet, but be very careful: laws change, and you could find yourself accidentally using an outdated document or one from another country that doesn't apply here. You might also miss out on putting in some valuable information just because t isn't in the lease template you downloaded and you didn't know to think of it yourself.

DRAWING UP AN INVENTORY

Without an inventory, you'll have a hard time making any deductions from your tenant's deposit when they move out, because you won't have a record of the state the property was in at the start.

A good inventory will specify the exact condition of every internal element of the property, along with pho-

tographic evidence.

There's nothing stopping you from drawing up the inventory yourself, but it's probably a good idea to use a professional: they'll do a better job, and they're clearly neutral in the event of a dispute.

The inventory should take place just before the tenant moves any of their possessions in, and the tenant should be given a copy at the check-in. They should be given a reasonable period of time to review it, then raise any points of disagreement or sign to indicate their acceptance.

So once you've got the first month's rent and the deposit cleared in your bank account, and the tenant has signed to acknowledge the receipt of all that paperwork, you can finally hand over the keys and let the tenant move in.

GARLIC PARMESAN TWISTS

hese may look like a cinnamon bun but they are 100 per cent savoury. A creamy cheese filling is rolled within a buttery brioche-style dough to bake up into cheesy magnificence! These make a great brunch treat for mother's day, a birthday or any other special occasion. You could even serve them as a starter at your next dinner party.

Parmesan twists | Makes 12 Prep time: Day before Cook time: 50 mins

Ingredients

For the dough:

- 3 ¼ cups all-purpose flour
- 2 tbsp granulated sugar
- 2 1/4 tsp instant dry yeast
- ●1 tsp salt
- ½ cup hot water (hot from the tap)
- 1/3 cup cold milk
- 2 large eggs, room temperature
- 1 cup unsalted butter, room temperature

For the filling:

- 1 ¼ cups milk
- 1 ½ tbsp cornstarch
- Garlic cloves, minced 1 tsp Dijon mustard
- 1 ½ cups coarsely grated White Cheddar cheese
- 1 cup finely grated
- Parmesan cheese ¼ cup chopped fresh parsley

For the glaze:

- ¼ cup maple syrup
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 pinch dried chili flakes or cayenne
- 2 green onions, thinly sliced

Directions

the flour, sugar, yeast and salt into a large bowl. Stir the hot water and milk together, and then add this and the dough is almost combined. Break onions overtop. Serve warm.

the butter into pieces and add a few at a time as mixing. Continue to mix until the dough is smooth looking, it will still be very soft. Transfer this to a clean bowl, cover with plastic wrap and let this sit on the counter for an hour before putting it in the fridge overnight.

Step 2

For the filling, whisk the milk, cornstarch, garlic and mustard together in a medium pot and then turn the heat on medium. Whisk this until it reaches a full simmer and thickens, about 6 minutes. Reduce the heat to medium low and then whisk in the white cheddar until melted in, followed by the Parmesan. Remove the pan from the heat and stir in the parsley. Let this cool to room temperature and then chill for at least 2 hours before using. The sauce can also be made a day ahead.

When you're ready to bake the rolls, preheat your oven to 190°C and grease a large casserole dish or baking tray. Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface and roll out to a 30 by 40cm rectangle. Spread the chilled cheese filling over the dough and roll up from the long side. Slice the dough into 12 pieces and arrange them in the baking dish. Cover the dish with plastic wrap or a clean cloth and let this sit on the counter for about an hour, until the twists rise by about 50%. Bake the twists for about 40 minutes, until golden brown and the cheese is bubbling in places. Cool the buns in the pan on a rack for 15 minutes before glazing.

While the twists are baking, pre-Start by making the dough. Measure pare the glaze. Heat the maple syrup, garlic and chili flakes over low heat for about 5 imldutes and set aside. Brush the tops of the twists with the the eggs to the bowl and mix until maple glaze and sprinkle the green

'REMOVE BATHABILE DLAMINI FROM OFFICE'

·OHANNESBURG - The Ahmed Kathrada Foundation has joined the call for the dismissal of former social development minister Bathabile Dlamini.

The foundation's call comes after the Democratic Alliance earlier on Friday called for the quick dismissal of both Dlamini and Malusi Gigaba.

Ordered

The Constitutional Court ordered Dlamini on Thursday to pay 20 per cent of legal fees incurred in the social grants saga. The court also ordered that the Director of Public Prosecutions make a call on whether Dlamini should be charged with perjury for lying under oath. "That her conduct went against the values of the Constitution should lead us to question her fitness to continue serving as a public representative in our Cabinet. Even though she has been moved from the social development department, what assurances do we have that she will not once again act in a 'reckless and grossly negligent' manner as minister of women in the



Minister Bathabile Dlamini.

presidency?" said the foundation's Executive Director Neeshan Balton.

The foundation said the judgment set precedent for holding to account those who may have abused their positions of power, but would have avoided responsibility, with the state paying for legal costs.

"The ruling makes it very clear that public representatives who act in a manner that is negligent or in bad faith to the courts can be held personally accountable - something which is going to be an important element of rebuilding a state with integrity.

"What this ruling does is that it affirms the rights of the most needy and vulnerable in society, over the dictates of public representatives who may imperil those rights," Balton said.

The foundation also paid homage to Black Sash and Freedom Under Law, which were integral in seeing the matter heard to the country's apex court.

"We must congratulate Black Sash and Freedom Under Law on their victory, and commend them for fighting this fight. When Black Sash and the Centre for Applied Legal Studies filed an urgent application at the Constitutional Court in March last year on the SASSA issue, they in effect prevented massscale disaster in this country.

"Millions of South Africans would have had their livelihoods endangered, and we really have these organisations to thank for averting the crisis."

COSATU is no longer the ANC's elections trump card

OHANNESBURG - The labour federation used to ensure millions of votes for the governing party - that is now far from guaran-

South Africa's governing party, the African National Congress (ANC), may have to fight next year's general election without the hundreds of thousands of votes its trade union federation ally has delivered in the past. This isn't because its alliance partner won't organise votes for the ANC but because it can't.

Conference

The ANC's labour ally, the Congress of SA Trade Unions (COSATU), held its conference recently. In a now familiar ritual, it suggested it might not support the ANC next year. It then declared it would - but would expect policy concessions in exchange for

No one except a few reporters looking for material took this seriously. COSATU regularly insists that its support for the ANC is conditional on the governing party adopting union-friendly policies. But having stamped its foot, it always supports the ANC. This was so when the ANC was run by former president Jacob Zuma, who many in COSATU opposed. It's likely to be even more so now that it is led by President Cyril Ramaphosa, a former COSATU unionist for whom it campaigned at last year's ANC conference, and who received a rousing welcome when he addressed the latest conference.

Union support at election time has, since the end of apartheid in 1994, been a huge asset for the ANC.

For some years after democracy's advent, unions were the most organised force in South Africa. COSATU, as the largest union federation, would use its organisation to mobilise its members - more than two million at its peak - and their families to support the ANC. No one is sure how many votes it got out for the ANC but it may well have run into millions. In theory, COSATU backing it next year means the ANC can rely on those votes again.

Comfort

Again, in theory, this would not only help the ANC to a comfortable majority. It would cement the implied bargain which has governed relations between the ANC and COSATU since 1994. Its terms are that COSATU would, despite complaining, allow the ANC to set economic policy as long as the ANC allowed it a veto over labour law changes. COSATU would also continue campaigning for the ANC as long as the implied bargain held firm. A by-product was that some COSATU leaders would end up in Parliament and government on the ANC ticket.

But in practice, both the votes COSATU mobilised and the implied bargain are in danger. News24

Zille takes flak over matric farewell party

APETOWN - A rowdy midweek matric farewell party at Western Cape Premier Helen Zille's official residence has raised the ire of neighbours and the ANC - who are now calling for her to vacate Leeuwenhof Estate.

In a statement, Western Cape legislature caucus chair, Sharon Davis, of the ANC said: "It is an absolute disgrace that Western Cape Premier Helen Zille held a late-night binging after-party at a state facility for learners of a posh boy's

"She has set the worst example ever to teenagers. What an abuse of state property and privilege!

"No excuse by Zille or anybody else is acceptable. The ANC calls for a full investigation on why this revelry was allowed." Zille confirmed yesterday that she had allowed her foster grandson, Chulumanco Mputing, who attends Rondebosch Boys High School, to host his matric farewell after-party at her home. Zille fostered the boy after his mother, Zille's former housekeeper, died of cancer when he was still young.

She confirmed to Weekend Argus that "the party this week was the after-party of the matric class of a young man that I have raised as my own son".

She also said she had written letters to 80 of her neighbours in which she explained the nature of the party and requested tolerance and patience during the time of the party. Weekend Argus

EFF denies internal problems after 10 members lose parliamentary seats

APE TOWN - The EFF has denied that it is battling to resolve internal conflicts after more than 10 of its members lost their seats in Parliament.

In the previous general elections the EFF won 25 seats in Parliament, but out of this number, about 11 EFF MPs have resigned or relinquished their seats as a result of contravening the party's

EFF Chief Whip Floyd Shivambu, however, denied that the party was battling to keep its members in Parliament. He said the party has since its inception and presence in Parliament fired three people. "The majority we have redeployed to the legislature and to local municipalities. Wherever we think we need deeper attention in the province or whatever level, we will then redeploy

those people there.

"This is to make sure that we align

our work properly," said Shivambu. In 2015, the EFF showed the door to its former MP Khanyisile Litchfield-Tshabalala, who left the party to join the United Democratic Movement.

Litchfield-Tshabalala was fired alongside Mpho Ramakatsa and Andile Mngxitama. Ramakatsa was the party's national co-ordinator while Mngxitama was a member of the interim central command team and the "war council" until the party's National People's Assembly in Mangaung in December.

The trio were booted out for speaking to the media while on suspension, implying financial impropriety in the party, leaking information to the media, and not attending the State of the Nation Address. IOL

Vavi 'sexual advances' allegation settled as a 'misunderstanding'

OHANNESBURG - A sex allegation which a NUMSA employee levelled against SA Federation of Trade Unions (SAFTU) General Secretary Zwelinzima Vavi, has been settled as a misunderstanding, the breakaway union federation said in a statement on Friday.

"For the record, it is true that a [National Union of Metalworkers of SA] staff member expressed her discomfort and made allegations that the SAFTU general secretary made unwanted sexual advances and/or handled her inappropriately," a statement said.

The allegations were made during September 2017. On the same day these allegations were brought to the attention of the SAFTU national office bearers, they acted swiftly." NUMSA and SAFTU gave the complainant a chance to "express herself' and say how she wanted the matter handled and Vavi was also asked separately for his version. "He denied the allegations," according to the statement sent by Vavi, NUMSA Secretary General Irvin Jim and spokesperson Patrick Craven. They said the woman asked for a formal apology from Vavi because she wanted it settled informally and



kept confidential.

in writing that there had been a misunderstanding between themselves." The statement said the woman accepted this and stated twice that she did not want to take the matter any further. We continue to look at realities of becoming a chef because everything has its downfalls, and Scene will be discussing that.



Cooks can now hold their heads high when they proclaim that this is a career


choice, with great promise along with an extraordinary amount of hard work.

FOR REAL eople looking for jobs are frequently unreasonable.

People looking for people can be equally demanding of things that don't exist. The hard, cold math of the food and beverage industry include the algorithm that income has to equal or exceed outlay, that space and time are finite quantities, that family restaurants far outnumber five star winners, that people behave in human ways and that all food and beverage business is dependent on the whims and desires of customers.

Everyone thinks they are special, that the rules of physics and economics do not apply to them, and some people are right in believing this. On the whole, however, the rules of probability apply to most of us.

For over twenty years I have been repeating the same obvious truths to people who want a day job in a high end restaurant (high end diners eat sandwiches for lunch), who want to replace the top chefs of the country on graduating from culinary school, who want to reinvent a wheel which has broken great people and spaced out dreamers in it's unstoppable roll thought the

annals of restaurant history. Everyone is, of course, special, but perhaps not in the place or manner in which they believe to be. The following are the pieces of disabuse which have issued from this desk forever. May they be of use to you or at least amusing

RESTAURANT REALITIES

Talent isn't enough: In addition to talent, every chef, who is essentially a manager, has to have a profound grasp of the relationships of space, energy, money and product. S/he has to be able find the ideal relation between restaurant volume, number and quality of people available to produce product, optimal pricing potential for the restaurants demographics and the level of complexity of product to be served. This knowledge is not learned in two years or in short stays, nor is it learned where cooks are given the culinary liberties everyone desires. They are learned in disciplined and orderly environments under the eye of professional chefs. Having great talent makes you a great cook. Not a great chef.

Professionals take time to ripen: It takes at least five years to become a good chef. More like ten to become a great one. Smart culinary professionals build a provenance in their career line, working for extremely demanding and exacting supervisors. Learning the details and trivia of a professional kitchen is not a kind process. It takes correction which is essentially criticism. Those who do not have the patience or the character to undergo the forging process will never be great in their fields.

It's not about your bliss: Creativity and passion are highly overrated.

Without extensive knowledge of the tools and resources of your trade, your creativity is wild gesticulation. Passion is egocentric desire to please your own emotions. Cold, hard understanding of every aspect of your trade, practice and education trump both of these. Even the most innovative of chefs have a strong analytical hold on the realities of their product and process, in which passion is only one component and at times not even that

It is, however, about your satisfaction. Passion or not, what you do every day should provide you with pleasure.

There's a Fly in Every Ointment: Your job is not designed around you, so it's your task to design yourself around your job. There is no per-

fect job, but there are jobs which suit you better than others, and you will be happier if you can objectively assess your weaknesses and strengths. Every job on the face of the earth has a problem attached, whether it be too little direction, dysfunctional co workers, too much structure or too little exposure. The list is endless. Your best bet is to be realistic in seeking the jobs, find the fly you can live with and teach it to stand up and beg. You earn what you are worth when you are worth it. Compensation of chefs early in their careers is usually better at locations which do not promise the best career advancement.

The high quality kitchens which offer the best training and build the best habits are less attractive financially and less emotionally gratifying than the less stringent kitchens which offer higher positions and better wages to less seasoned staff. Intelligent cooks looking to build careers will consider the long term options offered by the restaurants they choose rather than immediate positives.

Choosing the right career path in not the most lucrative positions can bring you double income later in life.


2. RELISHING AN ACQUIRED SKILL

Not everyone will like everything you prepare, and a good chef knows not to take poor reviews personally.


Take criticisms as an opportunity to learn and improve your craft. Stay at the top of your game by taking the critiques, and using them to construct an even better version of yourself and your art.

"You'll be amazed at how I always thought that wine just goes with anything, until we had an event at school where we did food


and wine pairing. I got to understand and appreciate the relationship food and wine have. Totally amazing,"

Do you ever ask yourself what gives chefs



The Deep Learning Indaba (DLI) exists to celebrate and strengthen machine learning in Africa through state-of-the-art teaching, networking and policy debate.



Without their assistance the department's participation in the 2018 DLI would not have been possible.



the 2018 DLI agenda included lectures delivered by world renowned AI and ML practitioners and captains of industry. Major topics covered at the Indaba included: Machine Learning fundamentals, feed-forward networks, convolutional neural networks, recurrent neural networks and reinforcement learning. Practical sessions were conducted to complement the material presented in the lectures and addressed the practical considerations around implementing deep learning models.

The practical sessions were conducted on the Google Colaboratory plat-form, https://colab.research.google.com, and were intended to allow participants time to engage with the many tutors, mentors and speak-

ers attending the Indaba. The practical's were implemented in Python and Tensorflow framework. Tensorflow or Flow (https://www.tensorflow.org/) is an open source software library for high performance numerical computation.

Its flexible architecture allows easy deployment of computation across a variety of platforms (CPUs, GPUs, TPUs), and from desktops to clusters of servers to mobile and edge devices.

Originally developed by researchers and engineers from the Google Brain team within Google's AI organization, it comes with strong support for machine learning and deep learning and the flexible numerical computation core is used across many other scientific domains.



MBRACING ICTS IN BIODIVERSITY RESEA

eneral overview on the use of ICTs in Biodiversity conservation

For the purpose of this communication, biodiversity is briefly defined as a variety of life on Earth. The Kingdom of Eswatini is richly endowed with endemic biodiversity. These are plant and animal species found only in the Kingdom of Eswatini. As a result of this their conservation becomes a paramount priority both globally and locally. This is because while it may not always be obvious, these biodiversity plays a key role in our everyday lives. They are the primary life support of the Earth.

Different species provide ecosystem services that we largely depend on. These include among others: provision of wild fruits, pasture to our livestock, nutrient cycling in our farms, pollination of our crops, provision of medicine, decomposition of waste by fungi and bacteria, provision of shade, a provision of building materials and protection of soil from ero-

sion. We also depend on biodiversity for the air that we breathe and the water that we drink. Wetlands remove pollutants from the water and make it safe for drinking while plants clean the air by absorbing carbon dioxide from our industries.

Despite all these, biodiversity is constantly faced with the global threat of extinction from our actions. Some of these threats are over-exploitation, landscape degradation from agriculture, pollution of water bodies, largescale water abstraction from wetlands, habitat loss, bush encroachment, invasive species, climate change, veld fires and bush encroachment.

Adopted These threats are also prevalent in the Kingdom of Eswatini. In order to curb these threats, conservationists, academics and governments all over the world have to cooperate in conserving biodiversity and minimize its loss. Some of the strategies adopted by governments for the conservation of biodiversity include policy development, the establishment of nature and game reserves and community based natural resources manage-

ment. Globally Information and Communication Technology (ICT) has emerged as one of the reliable inter-

vention

versity conservation. ICTs play an important role in biodiversity research, biodiversity monitoring and communication on biodiversity issues. They have the ability to efficiently collect, analyse and interpret large volumes of data. Availability of reliable analysed data helps to strengthen decision making, planning and campaigning for biodiversity conservation. ICTs can be implemented to conduct biodiversity and community-led conservation initiatives through the use of mobile phones and social media platforms.

Social media enables online virtual communities' group to embark on conservation discussions and sharing of information irrespective of the geographical locations. Communities can be alerted through the short messaging system (SMS) or using unstructured services supplementary system (USSD) instead of using the traditional methods only.

This is because community plays a principal role in conversation by participating in conservation initiatives such as stop

> wildlife trafficking, stop poaching, stop human and wildlife conflict as well as biodiversity and conversation fundraising activities. Mobile technology and social media platforms support bilateral communication between rangers in remote conservation areas if properly implemented. Detecting

Such technologies have the potential to contribute significantly in monitoring threats to the wildlife, detecting signs of deforestation, and to alert communities to any dangers posed by wildlife. According to a report from Wildlife Crime Tech (2013), data from devices such as camera traps, embedded cameras, GPS tags, drones and satellites can be used to detect poaching.

Digital technology is changing nature conservation in increasingly

profound ways. According to Koen (2015), the digital technology involves all types of electronic equipment and applications that use information in the form of numeric code. That means it includes all the and Information Communication Technology (ICT)

devices that capture, store, process and output digital infor-

1s). Information and Communication technology plays a paramount role in the monitoring and conservation of wildlife in a more efficient manner than the traditional methods. ICTs provide unprecedented opportunities in conservation through the use of advanced technological tools such as high-tech remote sensing, satellite tracking, global positioning system (GPS) mapping, global information system (GIS), radio tracking, automated footprint identification techniques, image sensor network and mobile technologies

Such tools help in understanding the threatened species to prevent their extinction and to revitalize their population. For instance, ICTs such as database management systems can be used to design and creation of a database for threatened, endangered, vulnerable and rare species or wildlife to monitor and visualize its population and distribution, habitat use and preferences, planning and management of conservation programmes, progress of conservation activities and comparison of historical and present wildlife diversity. In wildlife conservation, ICTs including GIS, remote sensing, image sensor network and satellite imagery have the capacity to collect data on a real-time

Mobile technologies such as laptops, tablets and smartphones support realtime tracking and monitoring of wildlife in distant geographical regions. South Africa developed a high-tech handheld data capture solution called Cybertracker to capacitate rangers and animal trackers to communicate their environmental observations.

Integration

In addition to that, Pardeep (2017) states that Cybertracker GPS field data collection system allows non-ICT-literate users to accurately log and record wildlife data using a special designed icon-driven system and then plot maps showing exactly where the observations were made using GPS. Along with GIS systems and satellite, radio tracking is the most popular technology that is widely used in the conservation world.

The integration of monitoring and tracking digital technologies further extend the capabilities of ICTs in collecting data about animal behaviour with respect to environmental changes. Therefore, location and behaviour of elusive specifies can geo-located and remotely monitored over a period of time in distant regions or locations

The adoption of ICTs for wildlife conservation in the Department of Biological Sciences (UNESWA)

The University of Eswatini through the Department of Biological Sciences plays a critical role in biodiversity conservation in the Kingdom of Eswatini. The Department offers courses that equip students with modern research and conservation skills. These include among oth-



ers (i) Ecological Field Techniques, (ii) Applied Ecology, (iii) Landscape Ecology and (iv) Biodiversity conservation. In these courses, the students learn how to integrate ICTs for biodiversity research, conservation and monitoring. Currently, the Department of Biological Sciences established biodiversity research and monitoring permanent sites (plots) in Mlawula nature reserve, Mbuluzi game reserve and Malolotja nature reserve. To succeed in all these, the Department of Biological Sciences at UNESWA uses ICT for some of the following:

Data collection: Camera traps (Figure 1) for animal counts, Anabats for bats detection, Bird calls library for birds' identification.

Mapping: Use of remote sensing and Geographical Information Systems (GIS) to analyse data on biodiversity. Remote sensing also helps to evaluate long-term impacts on biodiversity, ecosystems and habitats.


Information management: Creation of databases for data storage, analysis and

Monitoring: Change detection on the status of wildlife habitats over long periods of time.

Communication: ICT is used for communicating research findings with other stakeholders. Recently the department hosted the 3rd Symposium on Biodiversity Research where ICT was chiefly used for communicating the research findings.


Conclusion

The adoption and implementation of ICTs in biodiversity conversation can promote environmental or ecological sustainability. ICTs are major drivers for ecological sustainability when properly implemented and adopted. Globally, ICTs applications have supported the processing environmental information in the form of monitoring systems, databases and information systems, analytical and simulation models, spatial information processing, applications for environmental protection, research, planning, and disaster mitigation. Hence, ICTs have led to the development of new emerging field called Environmental informatics, that integrates some elements of computer science such as database systems, geographic information systems, modelling and simulation, knowledge-based systems and neural networks, in order to solve environmental issues.

every type of food there is in the entire universe we decided to just talk about the few foods you should defibnately try before you die, some of them you

might know but these are recommended by most chefs around the world as they are the type of food you should try to get to taste the whole world.

1. SPRING ROLLS

pring rolls play a huge role in Asian cuisine, and Vietnam is no exception.
A popular Vietnamese spring roll dish is nem nuong cuon, which is grilled pork sausage wrapped in rice paper with lettuce, cucumber, carrot, daikon,

and mint served with a (usually secret) special sauce.

Its cousin, goi cuon, utilizes the same basic ingredients but with shrimp in addition to pork. Nem nuong cuon and goi cuon can be found at food carts and in practically every restaurant in the country.



2. CEVAPCICI

roatia, Bosnia, Serbia, and Montenegro may have a divided history, but cevapcici is a fan favorite across all borders.

Depending on where you are in the Balkans, the type of meat used in the dish may differ usually pork, lamb, beef, or a combination of the three.

Cevapcici is prepared with onions and garlic and then grilled, boiled, or fried. Five to 10 finger-sized pieces of sausage are often served with home-baked breads used to make sandwiches.

On the side you'll typically find ajvar, a spread that will have you licking your fingers to get every last bit of the roasted red peppers.



3. GNOCCHI

nless you've been to Uruguay, you've probably never heard of Dia de Noquis, or Gnocchi Day. By the end of the month money has run out, and the combination of potatoes, flour, and an egg makes for a budget-friendly dish. Many Uruguayan restaurants advertise their gnocchi dishes, and a favorite is the classic, noqui de papa, or potato gnocchi.



4. MEZE

an't decide what to eat off the menu? Order meze (also spelled mezze). It's this part of the world's version of Spanish tapas. Depending on where you are, meze could include a variety of local dishes that may include labne (strained yogurt cheese), baba ghanoush (seasoned diced eggplant), muhammara (a hot pepper dip with breadcrumbs and walnuts), and tabboule h (bulgur, finely chopped parsley, mint, tomato, scallions, lemon juice, and olive oil).



6. COMPLETO

hile ranks among the world's top producers of avocados.

Its unique natural barriers the Pacific Ocean to the west, the Andes Mountains to the east and the Atacama Desert to the north help protect vulnerable avocado trees from pests and disease. To sample a Chilean avocado staple, order a completo. It's a hot dog, twice the size of an American hot dog, topped with avocado, tomatoes, sauerkraut, and mayonnaise. If that's not your thing, don't despair, avocados are indispensable to the Chilean diet and there are plenty of options to include avocado in each meal.



7. KANGAROO MEAT

angaroo has long been eaten by Australia's Aborigines. The meat has lots of protein but very little fat. It can be prepared much the same as other meats as a roast, skewered, or made into sausages or medallions. The meat is best cooked medium rare to medium in order to capture the flavors.



5. POUTINE

his traditional Quebecois dish is made with French fries, brown gravy, and cheese curds. In the not-so-distant past, celebrities and public officials would sometimes hide their passion for poutine because of its working-class origins. But its popularity is on the rise, and these days chefs are adding meat, caramelized onions, and other twists to this famous, gluttonous dish.

While you may think you've seen fries and brown gravy before New Jersey and your disco fries, , you haven't had poutine until you've had those fries and brown gravy with squeaky cheese curds. Squeaky, you ask? If the curds squeak as you chow down, it's a sure sign that they are the freshest curds.







Violence begets violence

t seems that the Swaziland National Association of Teachers (SNAT) is now promoting an ethos of violence.

This is difficult to shake considering what scenes transpired in the previous two protest actions they have been involved in.

Last month, a station commander was wrestled to the ground by a teacher, during a class between teachers and the police. It was reported-by both newspapers-that the teacher allegedly strangled and floored the station commander, who was armed with a gun.

This incident speaks volumes of the mentality of the teachers nowadays-no matter the provocation (and it is not our intention to go into it).

Apparently, that incident, which was captured by our photographer, upset the teachers, who are now harassing our journalists with impunity. It is hardly the kind of behaviour we would expect from an organisation that claims to represent democratic values, one of which is freedom of the press and expression.

It appears that teachers now want to employ the very thinking that they claim to be 'violently opposed' to, which is the mind-set of having things your way all the time.

On Thursday, teachers embarrassed not just these values they are pursuing in their protest actions, but the very profession. They, at the premises of the United States Embassy, attacked a photographer who was on assignment to cover this protest action. Because they believe they do not see eye-to-eye with the newspaper, a very unfortunate but misinformed position, they are now taking matters on to their hands.

The manner they attacked the journalist is a new low by any of their own standards. It is embarrassing and despicable. It is abhorrent and should never be allowed.

There is no defence for anyone taking the law on to their own hands, when there are platforms and options for dialogue to solve things amicably are there.

Ironically, it probably demonstrates the kind of teachers we have, for even as you read this, teachers have employed the kind of go-slow that defies a court order. But, that is a subject for another day.

What concerns us is that this kind of violent behaviour should never be the option; especially because the very same teachers want a critical, firm but fair media. We do not want to believe that these are the attributes of a media only when it suits people.

In any democracy, we are allowed to differ in opinion; and position. We should never be intimidated to see things the way people want. We should be free to report events in our society, without the fear of intimidation. But the thinking that members of the fourth estate will be subjected to harassment and violence by the very people who should uphold these values sets a very dangerous precedent.

It will be the Observer journalist now, but who will it be tomorrow? Should we now expect that teachers will someday assault pupils when they refuse to engage in a sympathy protest action?

That is not so farfetched by the way.

An injury to one, is an injury to all, they always chant. Seems they can't live by their own ethos.

Double standards. And, that's called stupidity. Harassing and assaulting a journalist in his line of duty is absolute foolishness. I have no other word for it, unfortunately.


No matter what gripe the teachers had with the newspaper or whatever reason, they acted stupidly. It's still not a good enough reason to attack someone in their line of duty.

turbing. We cannot condone such barbaric behaviour in a peaceful country like ours. For goodness sake, these workers were on a protest march and not armed to be viewed as enemies of our national peace. Usage of minimum force would have done the trick, not this brutal-

ity we saw. They certainly needed no harsh treatment and such violent treatment from the law enforcers. A humane way of enforcing law and order is quite crucial here, but what we witnessed is far worse and a provocation of the highest order. MBEKI'S MISSIVE: IN THE NAME OF 'OUR PEOPLE'

n a 30-page leaked document on land and the national question, titled What Then About Land Expropriation Without Compensation, the Thabo Mbeki Foundation (TMF) elucidates both historic context but crucially an analysis of a resolution of the ANC's 54th National Conference in December 2017 on "land expropriation without compensation".

Without going into the settings of the document about the "glorious National Democratic Revolution" and its "victory of 1994", the document presents some important perspectives about debates inside the ANC, especially about non-racialism and expropriation of land without compensa-

The tone of the document clearly indicates the hand of former President

Thabo Mbeki writ large and seeks to methodically outline the ANC's historical position on its attempts to assume the role of, "frontline fighters for the creation of a non-racial, democratic, humane and humanist global human society".

At the heart of the TMF treatise is perhaps the most foundational of concerns for the nation, that of how the ANC will reconcile the impact of its December 2017 resolution on land expropriation without compensation with its stated commitment to building a nonracial society.

The document veers into detail on the trajectory of the land question within the ANC from its inception in 1912 to various congresses and resolutions culminating in the adoption of the Freedom Charter. Two core principles are highlighted: "South Africa belongs to all who live in it, black and white; and "the land shall be shared among those who work it".

In further references to the Freedom Charter and the Strategy and Tactics documents, the document forcefully asserts that, "throughout the evolution of this policy, over 105 years, which has most often included land expropriation, there had never been any decision by the National Democratic Movement until December 2017 that such land expropriation as might be necessary would exclude compensation".

In the juxtaposition between past and present in the document, the following might portend a scenario that might play out as the ANC heads toward the 2019 election. It states, "If the ANC abandons these two principles and strategic positions, it must accept that it is turning its back on its historical position as the 'parliament of the people' by repudiating views and hopes about the future of our country which the masses of our people have held for many decades, ready to pay any price in their defence".

The document states that its concerns about expropriation without compensation has nothing to do with expropriation or no compensation. It has to do with the extremely fundamental question of the very definition of the nature, character and objectives of the ANC, and that is its position as leader of all

South Africans (black and white), its non-racial character and mission, and the rule of law. If the Nasrec resolution should stand, the Freedom Charter would have to be changed to:

"South Africa belongs to all who live in it, black and white, except as this relates to land"; and,

"All national groups are equal before the law, except as this concerns land!"

The document goes on to state in no uncertain terms: "Certainly,

ongratulations, Elections and Boundaries Commission (EBC) for high level of professionalism and resounding success in election 2018.

Taking into consideration the level of tension that prevailed during the pre-elections period, particularly as elections observers were already in country.

TINKHUNDLA, INDIGENOUS GOVERNANCE SYSTEM

In reading Chancellor William's book 'The Destruction of Black Civilisation: Great Issues of Race From 4500 BC to 2000 AD.' The chapter on, African Constitutions: Birth of Democracy, my indigenous soul and lens began connecting dots unearthing the existence of indigenous governance systems in Africa. Hence, making the significance of 1978, when King Sobhuza II declared our indigenous system of governance, Tinkhundla. The profound 1978 moment of decoloniality and Africanisation, as an indigenous prophet, African Renaissance activist. Marking reclaiming the African constitution and democracy negated by western writers as 'stateless societies' or 'societies without chiefs' or 'primitive democracies.' As indigenous governance systems interrogated by western souls and lenses did not conform to predetermined western structural patterns of state. According to Williams, 'with a one man as its executive head, a state being any collection of people occupying a given territory, living under their own government independently of external control.'

The African Union has created an appro-

priate context through the Africa We Want Agenda 2063, which inspires the continent to unite in voice to paint a picture of what they desire.

Tinkhundla indigenous governance connects with the African constitution and democracy negated by colonialism, distorted in coloniality and hijacked by modernity. Therefore, Tinkhundla is continuously evolving, engaging indigenous governance constitutive rules while being an African Renaissance and Pan Africanism project. Evolving whilst conscious of the negation emanating from colonised minds, who label this indigenous governance system as subjugating human rights of those living within the constituencies.

Understandable as 'stateless societies' were disrupted, and the notion of natural rights rooted within indigenous dignity is discriminated by human rights activists. The indigenous dignity that enabled the oneman executive peacefully coexisting with people occupying a given territory, living under their own government.

This is not to suggest that Tinkhundla indigenous government system is a perfect system, but it is a model for African democracy. With lots of issues and challenges emanating from its own fossilisation, when it resists transformative interventions enabling this system to respond to modernity.

In the meantime, Tinkhundla indigenous governance system hijacked by modernity, evident in that power and money are dominant constitutive rules. Power and money are modernity constitutive rules such that victory in the elections are unachievable without them. This requires a national dialogue that speaks to the integration of indigenous knowledge and modernity, as modernity was evident during the elections, and we can no longer turn a blind eye. This dialogue would respond to Agenda 2063 aspiration of a self-confident Africa, within its identity heritage, culture and shared values as a strong, united and influential global part-

NATIONAL DIALOGUE FOR SOCIAL COHESION

This national dialogue is critical for social cohesion, as opposed to the public display victim status in forums such as post-elections press conferences.

National dialogues require political maturity that evoke willingness to listen and engage, and not grandstand for only your views are the right ones. The findings and recommendations from both the African Union and SADC electoral observation missions require a national dialogue, where members of the nation are active participants. The issue of women participation is a significant issue and challenge that requires a national dialogue, as the inability to ensure equal representation is embarrassing. We can no longer hide under the narrative 'cultural practices' are contributing to this unachieved objective, as women were out in numbers voting for men during elections 2018.

The national dialogue will explore the possibility of ratifying, domesticating and implementing the African Charter on Democracy. Thus, creating an environment conducive to integrating indigenous knowledge and modernity, in a proactive not reactive manner. This would be an opportune moment to articulate our indigenous governance system, guided by the African Charter, which is fluid and not rigid. Agenda 2063 creates opportunities to recreate the Africa we want, and many African countries are looking for models for expressing African democracy. Evidently, current democracies rooted within modernity constitutive rules, create perpetual struggles for liberation, hence, Agenda 2063 and we celebrate 50 years of peace and sustainable development.

This national dialogue will create appropriate space to interrogate whether the populist statements are plural, inclusive and genuine democracy. Are achievable through integrating indigenous knowledge and modernity, reflecting democracy understood as plurality embracing active participation for meaningful coexistence. Plurality of all knowledge systems to coexist is not a threat to any side, translating into win-win towards social cohesion, engaging and embracing not only political participation but marginalise persons.

These include the youth and women, persons with disabilities and most significantly, the lesbians, gays, trans-

gender, and intersexual (LGTI) group currently discriminated. National dialogue requires genuine active participation towards social cohesion and not narrow and exclusive political interests and agendas, which are self-serving. Thus, all stakeholders and social partners must have the interest of the citizens of this country at heart, citisens whose ancestors were colonized and taken out of their indigenous context.

CONCLUSION

In conclusion, during this election 2018, I registered and voted during the primaries, as a committed member of Lutsango LwakaNgwane, I voted for women in all three categories. They did not win, and therefore, I withheld my vote during the secondary elections, as my vote will not take a man to parliament. I thank the Gender Unit in the deputy prime minister's office for inviting me to 'Embili Kanye Kanye' television show advancing the vote for a women campaign. This election 2018, made me realise we need to build the confidence of women throughout the country, and when I saw them queuing to vote now the results indicate they voted for men. I am convinced that a nationwide awareness campaign restoring women's indigenous dignity to evoke their leadership confidence is eminent. Considering the Kingdom of Eswatini national coat of arms symbolises 'Kanye Kanye' gender inclusivity, clearly does not permeate into grass-

Evidently, the knowledge politics that the African Union with all its legal frameworks needs to deal with, particularly with its commitment to Agenda 2063. Knowledge and wisdom is required, my voice with many others will lead painting pictures of the Africa we want, rooted within African Renaissance and Pan Africanism.

the argument that has been advanced by the ANC leadership since the 54th National Conference about the Land Question communicates the firm statement that the ANC has changed in terms of its character. It is no longer a representative of the people of South Africa." The document makes a scathing reference to former President Jacob Zuma's subversion of the ANC as a black political party, "Jacob Zuma was advancing a perspective about the 'resolution of the National Question' radically different from the long established and historic position of the ANC, which he led at the time".

For the EFF, it reserves classic Mbeki disdain and refers to the EFF's ideological subversion of ANC policy while pointedly highlighting his party's own breakaway from the PAC in 1958 because of a divergence on the question of non-racialism. He infers that the ANC is being led by the EFF on the land question, to its own detriment. The TMF's paper posits valid questions and proposals, some of -h may cause necessary discomfort if the country is to move in a direction that does not undermine constitutional guarantees to property rights, equality and non-discrimination. Under the rubric of the necessity for an Internal Review and Programme of Action on the land question, the paper questions what is rapidly becoming a false basis for the land question, including that of the extent of land hunger.

Equally valid is the question about land for what: farming or housing? The rural/urban question together

with that of positioning South Africa within a global economic context (or private owners of capital as the document refers) and the necessity for growth and jobs require pragmatic introspection by the ANC.

The TMF document categorically states too, that the current constitutional provisions are adequate and create an enabling framework for land reform. The document further raises the following important issues in the debate on land expropriation without compensation:

Does an amended Section 25 making provision for land expropriation without compensation attack the foundations of non-racialism and the rule of law? If this is true, a 75% majority will be necessary to amend it. Necessary land reform is not a

zero-sum game, where whites must lose so that blacks can win. It should be resolved in the national interest on a non-racial basis and with the rule of law intact.

The "land issue" must be resolved, not by a quick fix of taking from whites and giving to blacks, but by carefully considering all pertinent factors such as what should land be used for, who wants to farm and what the effect of all of this would be on food security. In the broader debate about our unity in diversity, it raises the important question of who are "our people"? This legitimate question by Cope leader Mosiuoa Lekota was not answered by the ANC leadership, asserts the document. Interestingly, the document seems to say that the Freedom Charter and

constitutional principle of non-racialism trumps the ANC's oft expressed dictum that its struggle is for "blacks in general and African in particular".

The TMF document has already caused a storm on social media, and elicited a response from Ace Magashule, taking a swipe at the "disloyalty" displayed by Mbeki.

What is more important though, is whether President Ramaphosa and his panel of advisors on land expropriation without compensation will take the issues raised by the TMF document seriously enough to reflect it in their advice to him? And will those ANC members in Parliament who will have to vote on a possible amendment of Section 25 reflect on these issues before they do?



am convicted, more than ever before, that if Jesus would incarnate or manifest in the flesh today, and we were to make our many prayer requests, He would say no more than what is already written.

As he was about to recover from a Near Death Experience, a man asked Jesus, "What is the purpose of life?" He had lived to a ripe old age as an atheist, largely because he saw life as meaningless, and he was just going through the motions, responding to each day according to the needs that arose; merely wandering without purpose.

The man writes that Jesus looked at him, perplexed and smiled. He then told him that the purpose of life 'is love'. And just to stretch our understanding, 'Love' is 'God' and 'God' is 'Love'. This is to say, if we have 'love', then we have 'God', and Jesus is the only means to God, who is love.

When Jesus told His disciples they knew the way where He was going, Thomas said to Him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going; so how can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the (only) Way (to God) and the (real) Truth and the (real) Life; no one comes to the Father but through Me." (John 14:4-6). That is why Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 5:21, "We are the righteousness of God in Christ Jesus."

This means that Jesus has restored the relationship between us, sinners, and God. This is where our discourse begins today. My task, by the grace of God, is to demonstrate how 'love' is the purpose of life; and how Jesus, through 'forgiveness', makes it possible for us to live optimally on earth with guarantees of eternity. Let us start with our Near Death Experience guy, as I demonstrate that what Jesus told him in a vision He had already declared in His word, and remember Jesus Himself is the word – that was there in the beginning, was with God and was God. (John 1:1).

In Matthew 22:36-39, Jesus was asked a similar question as was asked by our NDE guyby a lawyer, who was an expert in the Law of Moses, though phrased differently: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" I will rephrase this question for purposes of our discussion; 'What should we do to attain the purpose of life – that is to live optimally on

earth with guarantees of eternity? This is to say, what is the purpose of life?' And Jesus replied, quoting an ancient truth in **Deuteronomy** 6:5, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' "This is the first and greatest commandment.

The second is like it. 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself (that is, unselfishly seek the best or higher good for others.'" (AMP). This ancient truth was decreed by God Almighty with power on Mount Sinai, and Jesus said the whole Law as decreed by God depends on love, as I demonstrate below:

- You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.'
- Do not worship or give allegiance to anyone or anything other than God.
- Do not make any idols.

 Do not take the name of
- Do not take the name of the Lord in vain.
- Keep the Sabbath Holy.
- 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself (that is, unselfishly seek the best or higher good for others.'
- Honour your parents.
- Do not kill.
- Do not commit adultery.
- Do not steal.
- Do not bear false witness.
- Do not covet.

This ancient truth was fulfilled and sealed by the power of the blood of

Jesus on the cross in Calvary. That is why Jesus made the disclaimer as He set out on His earthly ministry, "Do not think that I came to do away with or undo the Law (of Moses) or the (writings of the) Prophets; I did not come to destroy, but to fulfil." (Mat. 5-17)

The question becomes, how is it possible to love God, whom I have never seen, and to love my neighbour, who hates me? It is not possible to love without following the example of God, who so loved the world that He gave His only son to show that indeed He had forgiven sin. As it is written in Matthew 6:12, "And forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us," it is impossible to tap into the benefits of the cross without forgiving our enemies as God forgave us, and similarly, forgiveness is impossible without following the example of God and give our priciest and most prized possession to show that we have forgiven. But what are we to give? This question can be rephrased to read 'If God's biggest possession is Jesus, what is our most prized possession?' As soon as we decide what we prize most, then we must make our minds to give this and no less.

I asked this question during one of my many marketplace evangelistic sermons, and got two interesting answers. The one was - man's most prized possession 'is food', another suggested 'money'. Both answers are important in the walk with Christ, but are wrong.

Here is a clue to help us decide what we price most: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself. Clearly, if loving yourself is the standard for loving others, or anything, then your priciest or most prized possession is 'yourself. Romans 12 helps us better understand how to benefit from the forgiveness granted us on the cross by giving ourselves as a living sacrifice.

Paul writes, "There I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies (dedicating all of yourselves, set apart) as a living sacrifice, holy and well-pleasing to God, which is your rational (logical, intelligent) act of worship." The AMP Bible explains this assertion as follows: In the Old Testament sacrificial system, the "job" of the sacrificial lamb was ended with its death.

An individual or household selected an animal according to the dictated terms, and it was sacrificed to cover sins.

Since Christ became the final atonement for sin, we no longer need the old system. But Paul is calling believers to consider their whole life as a sacrifice dedicated to God and His purposes, a "living" sacrifice, both holy and single-minded. Further Paul writes in Romans 12:2, "And do not be conformed to this world (any longer

with its superficial values and customs), but be transformed and progressively changed (as you mature spiritually) by the renewing of your mind (focusing on Godly values and ethical attitudes), so you may prove (for yourselves) what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect (in His plan and purpose for you)."

Confession of sin in itself is not enough to enable the believer to automatically walk in the Spirit. He or she must learn to yield their whole self to God (Ro.6:13; Jas 4:7). This involves both the body (Ro.12:1; 1Co 6:20) and the mind (Ro.12:2), since what is conceived in the mind is carried out by the body.

One's whole being must be presented by a decisive act of the will to God for His service. Yielding leads not only to dedication but also can result in separation: "do not be conformed to this world" (Ro. 12:2). Finally, yielding includes transformation of the mind.

This work is said to be accomplished through a lifetime of "renewing" the mind. Man's mind has been darkened '/ sin (Ro 8:7; Col1:21) and must be brought to the place where it thinks as God thinks (Eph. 4:23).

This renewing is said to come especially through prayer in everything (Php 4:6-7) and through constant meditation on the Word of God (Ps 119:1). This transformation is a lifelong process that will not be completed until we are with Christ (Php 1:6; 1 Jn 3:2).


reading this and you're feeling like things are falling apart or you're feel like you're being punished.

The project, which was supposedly conceptualised earlier this month after a warrant was issued for his arrest in DeKalb County, Georgia, comes on the heels of last month's compilation tape, 'Slime Language'. Comprised of six tightly-constructed songs, half of which are produced by Thug's fan-favourite producer, London On Da Track, this EP is being applauded as a return to form. However, this isn't merely Thug going back to the basics. Rather, it's a stark reminder of Thug's versatility and the chameleon-like way in which he embodies and subsequently sheds his influences.

Where last year's Beautiful Thugger Girls sat comfortably ahead of the curve, blending acoustic, trap and R&B leaning production into a futuristic album about love, this EP is a more concerted effort in reminding the public of how far his song-writing has come. 'On the Rvn' is Thug's first successful attempt at seamlessly bridging old and new vibes. Over the last half-decade, Thug's flows and delivery have become more tangible. Having recently gone on an Instagram rant about being the 'drip god,' it's clear that Thug feels underappreciated these days. 'On the Rvn', 'Icey' and 'Real In My Veins' all deal with Thug's role in shaping the current landscape of rap.

The production on this 23-minute

effort is uniformly great. While London

typically embodies a comfortable terrain for Thug to navigate, his contributions to 'On the Rvn' are decidedly more experimental. 'Icey' and 'Sin', produced by Wheezy and London, respectively, are stripclub ready bangers that sound like two sides of the same coin; one is bright and bubbly, the other dark and sinister. WHO revises DRC Ebola risk to 'very high'

INSHASA - The World Health Organisation announced it had revised its Ebola risk assessment in the Democratic Republic of Congo from high to "very high".

The WHO cited transport links and population movements as potential risk factors in offering its latest assessment while stressing that the global risk remained low.

"As the risk of national and regional spread is very high, it is important for neighbouring provinces and countries to enhance surveillance and preparedness activities.

"WHO will continue to work with neighbouring countries and partners to ensure health authorities are alerted and are operationally ready to respond," the body stated.

On Tuesday, the WHO's Deputy Director General for Emergency Preparedness and Response Peter Salama warned that neighbouring Uganda faced an "imminent" Ebola threat following a case in a border town near Lake Albert.

DRC's tenth Ebola outbreak since the first known case in 1976 came on August 1 in a highly restive northeastern region home to a clutch of armed groups near the border with Uganda, Rwanda and South Sudan.

The latest outbreak has killed 101 people, according to a latest WHO tally. AFP

Man who attacked presidential hopeful Bolsonaro acted alone

RASILIA - Adelio Bispo de Oliveira, the man who stabbed Brazil's presidential hopeful Jair Bolsonaro on the campaign trail, acted alone in a premeditated political attack, police said on Friday.

"There is no doubt that the motive for Mr Adelio's attack was his political opposition to ideas favoured by candidate Bolsonaro," federal police spokesperson Rodrigo Moraes Fernandes told reporters in Brasilia.

Bolsonaro - a former army captain accused by critics of racism, sexism and homophobia has been absent from the campaign trail as he recovers in hospital after being stabbed earlier this month. The stabbing was the latest in a series of bizarre twists in the election, from which the most popular candidate - Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva - has been barred as he serves a jail sentence for bribery.

Fernando Haddad has seen his popularity soar since he was officially named by the Workers' Party as the replacement candidate

In third place at the moment is centre-left candidate Ciro Gomes. AFP



...Death toll rises in Indonesia tsunami-quake

ALU - Nearly 400 people were killed when a powerful quake sent a tsunami barrelling into the Indonesian island of Sulawesi, officials said yesterday, as hospitals struggled to cope with hundreds of injured and rescuers scrambled to reach the stricken region.

The national disaster agency put the official death toll so far at 384, all of them in the tsunami-struck city of Palu, but warned the toll was likely to rise. Some 540 people were badly injured, it added.

In the city -- home to around 350 000 people -partially covered bodies lay on the ground near the shore, the day after tsunami waves 1.5 metres (five feet) came ashore.

There were also concerns over the whereabouts of hundreds of people preparing for a beach festival that had been due to start on Friday evening, the disaster agency said.

Hospitals were overwhelmed by the influx of injured, with many people being treated in the open air, while other survivors helped to retrieve

the remains of those who died.

One man was seen carrying the muddy corpse of a small child.

The tsunami was triggered by a strong quake that brought down buildings and sent locals fleeing for higher ground as a churning wall of water crashed into Palu, where there were widespread power blackouts.

Captured

Dramatic video footage captured from the top floor of a parking ramp in Palu, nearly 80 kilometres (50 miles) from the quake's epicentre, showed waves bring down several buildings and inundate a large mosque.

"I just ran when I saw the waves hitting homes on the coastline," said Palu resident Rusidanto, who like many Indonesians, goes by one name.

The shallow 7.5 magnitude tremor was more powerful than a series of quakes that killed hundreds on the Indonesian island of Lombok in July and August. AFP

Bowing to pressure, Trump agrees to FBI probe of Kavanaugh

ASHINGTON - Reversing course, President Donald Trump bowed to Democrats' demands on Friday for a deeper FBI investigation of Supreme Court nominee Brett Kavanaugh after Republican Sen. Jeff Flake baulked at voting for confirmation without it - a sudden turn that left Senate approval newly uncertain, amid allegations of sexual assault.

Kavanaugh's nomination had appeared back on track earlier on Friday when he cleared a key hurdle at the Senate Judiciary Committee. But that advance came with an asterisk.

Flake indicated he would take the next steps leading to full Senate approval — only after the further background probe, and there were suggestions that other moderate Republicans might join his revolt.

The abrupt developments gave senators, the White House and millions of Americans following the drama at home, hardly a chance to catch their breath after Thursday's emotional Senate hearing featuring Kavanaugh angrily defending himself and accuser Christine Blasey Ford determinedly insisting he assaulted her when they were teens. Emotions were still running high on Friday,

and protesters confronted senators in the halls.

"The country is being ripped apart here," said Flake. After he took his stance, Republican leaders had little choice but to slow their rush to confirm Kavanaugh, whom they had hoped to have in place shortly after the new court term begins tomorrow.

Trump quietly followed suit, though he had vigorously resisted asking the FBI to probe the allegations of sexual misconduct by Kavanaugh, now being raised by three women. AP

Remove illegal sanctions against Zim - Mnangagwa

EW YORK - Zimbabwean President Emmerson Mnangagwa has reportedly urged the west to lift sanctions against his country while the United States government continued to set stringent terms for their removal.

According to Daily News, speaking at the United Nations General Assembly in New York this week, Mnangagwa described the ongoing sanctions against his country as "illegal".

Mnangagwa was a former Robert Mugabe enforcer, but he now styled himself as a reformer, saying his country looked forward to playing a role as a "responsible member of the family of

Mnangagwa called for the immediate, unconditional removal of "continued illegal sanctions" as he badly needed foreign investment in Zimbabwe's long-collapsed economy, reported

Minister Clark optimistic of Brexit deal

LONDON - British Business Secretary Greg Clark said yesterday there were grounds for optimism that Britain would strike a Brexit deal with the European Union days after Prime Minister Theresa May said talks were at an impasse. EU leaders have dismissed May's proposals which many of her own lawmakers have heavily criticised. She has repeatedly said no deal would be better than a bad deal. "Of course we want a deal," Clark told BBC radio. "No one should be under any illusion that the prime minister and our negotiating team are absolutely determined..." AFP

Clashes leave 11 dead

LAGOS - A gunfight broke out near the central Nigeria city of Jos, killing 11 people and sparking outbreaks of violence across the city, an army spokesman said on Friday. The violence started late on Thursday evening on the outskirts of Jos, army spokesman Major Umar Adam told AFP. "Eleven are confirmed dead and several others injured, I can't say how many," Adam said. "Today (Friday) some youths blocked the road along Rukuba and attacked passersby," Adam said, adding that "many people were injured". "The situation now is relatively calm. Patrols have been intensified to ensure there is no breakdown of law and order," he added. AFP

Facebook accounts breached

SAN FRANCISCO - Facebook announced on Friday that up to 50-million accounts were breached in a security flaw exploited by hackers. The large social network said it learned this week of the attack that allowed hackers to steal "access tokens," the equivalent of digital keys that enable them to access their accounts. "It's clear that attackers exploited a vulnerability in Facebook's code," Vice President of Product Management Guy Rosen said in a blog post. "We've fixed the vulnerability and informed law enforcement." Facebook Chief Executive Mark Zuckerberg said engineers discovered the breach on Tuesday, and patched it on Thursday night. AFP

Melania Trump heading to Africa

NEW YORK - When Melania Trump flies to Africa next week on her first extended international journey without the president, she'll be following in the footsteps of her recent predecessors. First ladies before Mrs. Trump performed numerous roles on their trips to the vast continent, but mostly sought to foster goodwill toward the United States. Some made the trip to check on the status of US assistance programmes or announce new funding. Some played tourists, or brought their children along for the cultural experience. The current first lady leaves tomorrow on a weeklong trip to Ghana, Malawi, Kenya and Egypt, travelling only with members of her staff and a pool of journalists. AP

'Turbulence in ties threatens US'

BEIJING - A key diplomatic and security meeting between China and the United States next month may not take place due to tensions in relations, sources briefed on the matter said, potentially the latest casualty of worsening ties. Beijing and Washington are locked in a spiraling trade war that has seen them level increasingly severe rounds of tariffs on each other's imports. Friction between the world's top two economies is now moving beyond trade, with US President Donald Trump accusing Beijing this week of seeking to interfere in congressional elections, marking what US officials told Reuters was a new phase in an escalating campaign by Washington to put pressure on China. Reuters

'Very sorry' Murray ends season after suffering ankle injury

EIJING - Former world number one Andy Murray has brought his season to a premature end, pulling out of the China Open in Beijing after reaching the quarter-finals at the Shenzhen Open.

The 31-year-old Briton is battling to regain top form and fitness following hip surgery in January but British media, including the BBC, said that he has suffered a minor ankle problem.

Murray was not included when the China Open draw was made yesterday and also absent was world number three Novak Djokovic, who was offered a wildcard.

The China Open - which begins this weekend - has been hit by several high-profile pull-outs with Rafael Nadal not involved because of injury, Roger Federer saving himself for Shanghai and Serena Williams all absent. Murray, ranked 311 in the world, previously said that Beijing would be his final tournament this season and he is carefully managing his schedule following his operation in order to get the most out of his creaking body. He was beaten 6-4, 6-4 on Friday in Shenzhen by Spanish veteran Fernando Verdasco, although he defeated world number 11 David Goffin in the last 16 for the best win since his comeback.

Murray, a three-time Grand Slam title winner, will spend the winter working himself back to the sort of fitness levels that saw him capture nine titles in a stellar 2016 campaign, including his second Wimbledon crown and another Olympic gold.

"It was another three matches, which is positive," said Murray after defeat to Verdasco.

"But obviously I want to play better than that, I have higher ambitions than losing in the quarter-finals. I want to try to be better in these events.

Hertha stun Bayern for first win in nine years

ERLIN - Hertha Berlin midfielder Ondrej Duda scored his fifth goal in as many league games on Friday as Bundesliga leaders Bayern Munich suffered a shock 2-0 away defeat.

Berlin were deservedly 2-0 up at halftime at the sold-out Olympic Stadium in front of 74 669 fans, stunning Bayern thanks to a Vedad Ibisevic penalty before Slovakia's Duda, the league's top-scorer, added a stunning second

"They shouldn't have happened," he fumed after Bayern made many mistakes, especially in the first half.

"We shouldn't start talking badly about everything now - anyone who knows Bayern knows we won't put up with that". The defeat came at Kovac's old club and at the worst possible time with a Champions League game at home against Ajax looming on Tuesday.

CR7 lawyer dismisses rape allegations, threatens German magazine

ILAN - Cristiano Ronaldo's lawyers will reportedly take Llegal action a German magazine after they published accusations made by an American saying she was raped by the player.

According to Daily Mirror, Ronaldo was on holiday in Las Vegas in 2009 with his cousin and brother-in-law when he met the model.

Reports claim Ronaldo allegedly paid the model £287 000 as an out-of-court settlement, which contracted not to mention her claims. However, the play-

er's lawyers will now seek legal action against German publication Der Spiegel over the allegations, seaking compensation for moral damages. Ronaldo's lawyer, Schertz

Bergmann Rechtsanwälte, has since issued a statement denying the model's rape claim.

"The reporting in SPIEGEL is blatantly illegal. It violates the personal rights of our client Cristiano Ronaldo in an exceptionally serious way," The statement read, according to Daily

Europe in command in third Ryder Cup session

AINT-QUENTIN-EN-YVELINES - Rory McIlroy and Sergio Garcia laid the foundations for a dominant start by Europe to yesterday's Ryder Cup morning fourballs as the hosts sought to increase their 5-3 overnight advantage against the United States.

McIlroy, who struggled mightily in Friday's fourballs, looked far more like the four-time major champion as he reeled off four birdies on the front nine alongside Garcia to take a 4-up lead over Brooks Koepka and Tony

Englishman Paul Casey was equally impressive, if not more so, in the second fourballs, racking up five birdies on the opening six holes as he and Tyrrell Hatton charged 2-up ahead of Dustin Johnson and Rickie Fowler.

Tommy Fleetwood, the first European rookie to win two points on the first day of a Ryder Cup since Garcia in 1999, reprised his

successful partnership with British Open champion Francesco Molinari.

The pair were all square through 10 with Tiger Woods and a misfiring Patrick Reed at the turn, the latter finding the water as well as the gallery on a nightmare front nine for the reigning Masters cham-

The Europeans pulled two clear but Woods clawed a hole back at the 7th, pumping his fist in animated fashion, before levelling the contest with another birdie just after the turn.

Ian Poulter and Jon Rahm were all square with Jordan Spieth and Justin Thomas through nine.

Rahm plonked his ball into the water on the first two holes, but Poulter led the fightback with a birdie on seven to put Europe 1up in the anchor match only for Spieth to answer back on the eighth.

The US have not rallied to win from a first-day deficit since 1999, when they trailed 6-2 at the 'Battle of Brookline' in Massachusetts.







Man United face big decisions' after Hammer blow

ONDON - Former Manchester United defender Rio Ferdinand said the club faced some "big decisions" over Manager Jose Mourinho's future after a damaging 3-1 loss away to West Ham yesterday.

United's third defeat in seven Premier League games left them eight points behind leaders Liverpool and three adrift of the top four, with Mourinho's men now having played one game more than the teams above them in the table.

"As a footballer your DNA is about hard work and effort," said Ferdinand, now a pundit with BT Sport.

"I didn't see that today," added the former England centre-half, who began his career at West Ham.

"I didn't see them make two or three passes in succession – that's criminal.

"I don't see enough players working hard to say to the manager 'this is my place in the team'. You've got to work hard and grind and Man Utd didn't." And a concerned Ferdinand insisted: "There are some big decisions to be made at United now. There will be conversations at the top level, about the future of the manager and the squad, because the basics are not being done. There has to be something said."

United were behind as early as the fifth minute at the London Stadium when Anderson opened the scoring for West Ham.

'Pogba was never my vice-captain'

ANCHESTER - Manchester United Manager Jose Mourinho has denied that midfielder Paul Pogba, with whom he has reportedly fallen out, was ever his official vice-captain.

Following comments from Pogba which appeared to criticise Mourinho's tactics, the Portuguese manager announced that he was no longer going to captain Manchester United in the absence of regular skipper Antonio Valencia.

A frosty exchange between Mourinho and the French midfielder was filmed during Manchester United training this week. However, the former Chelsea boss has repeatedly played down reports of a falling out between himself and Pogba.

On taking away the captain's armband from the World Cup-winner, the 55-year-old was quoted by Sky Sports as saying: "Paul was not the vice-captain.

"We had Valencia as the captain and then we had a group of players that could be the vice-captain - one day I gave it to David de Gea, I gave it to Ashley Young, to Chris Smalling.

"I first thought about Paul last season, because (he is) a player of a different generation, younger player, the captain of the future.

WEST HAM PILE ON THE MISERY FOR MAN UTD

ONDON - West Ham stormed to a 3-1 win over an abject Manchester United to pile further pressure on Jose Mourinho.

The United manager selected Paul Pogba from the off following a week-long soap opera at Old Trafford but Felipe Anderson gave West Ham an early lead with his first Premier League goal.

Things rarely picked up after that setback as Victor Lindelof deflected in Andriy Yarmolenko's shot to double the advantage for Manuel Pellegrini's team two minutes before half-time.

Marko Arnautovic sealed the points after Marcus Rashford briefly gave the visitors hope, although more uncomfortable questions await Mourinho, who omitted Alexis Sanchez, Jesse Lingard and captain Antonio Valencia from his matchday squad.

A United line-up that looked cautious on paper started in tepid fashion and they were behind in the fifth minute – Anderson's impudent backheel finish coming after Mark Noble released Pablo Zabaleta down the right. The Brazilian's defensive work left a little more to be desired and he left

Arthur Masuaku isolated when Ashley Young roved down the West Ham left, crossing for Romelu Lukaku to head against the post.

Masuaku was a touch fortunate not to be penalised for a shove on Scott McTominay in the area and Mourinho's frustrations were compounded when Yarmolenko's strike took a wicked deflection off Victor Lindelof, leaving David de Gea with no chance.

After the break, substitute Rashford played in Young to deliver another delightful cross that Marouane Fellaini met at the back post – forcing Lukasz Fabianski into the save of the match.

A sliding Arnautovic almost converted Anderson's pass before the home faithful greeted Pogba's withdrawal in the pantomime style.

When play restarted, Rashford cleverly converted from Luke Shaw's corner but Noble picked out the yawning gap between Chris Smalling and McTominay in the United defence and Arnautovic coolly finished the job 16 minutes from time.

IVERPOOL - The moment Alisson Becker knew was coming is met with a telling laugh. Liverpool's new goalkeeper has been holding court in a private box overlooking Anfield's pitch, talking about his journey to this exalted position, when the narrative changes.

It is time to discuss Leicester City. Or, more accurately, it is time to discuss the incident when he tried to copy Johan Cruyff in his own penalty area but succeeded only in falling over his feet and giving away a calamitous goal.

These are the occasions when you get an insight into a player's character. For some, it would be off-limits, with all inquisitions batted away.

Alisson, though, is different and over the course of the next five minutes, it becomes apparent the season's highest profile mistake has not left any mark.

"I've locked myself in my room in the past but I don't do that anymore!" he says. "I am more mature today so I deal better with the mistakes than the many times when I locked

myself away and wanted to be alone. But if you look at my history, I'm not somebody who makes many mistakes

"My game is characterised by consistency and that is what has brought me to Liverpool and helped me grow and develop. I make simple saves: they are not to show off or Hollywood saves for the camera. I like to keep it simple. Yes, I'm working on playing with my feet so I take risks.

"I wait for options; hoping that a space for a pass will appear at the last moment. That's what happened at the Leicester game.

"The ball held up in the grass and, if it hadn't, I think I would have made a successful dribble. I know now I should have kicked the ball into the stands."

There is another smile as, unexpectedly, he turns to philosophy to conclude his summary. "The secret of the wise man is to learn from the errors of others," he says. "Unfortunately at Leicester, it was my

error. I do take some risks and leave it late to play the ball but I'll stop taking these risks in the Premier League because of the different style of play." Daily Mail

Guardiola warns City stars of social media dangers

ANCHESTER - Manchester City boss Pep Guardiola claims the rise of social media is a significant threat to the fragile relationship between managers and players.

Jose Mourinho's strained relations with Paul Pogba at Manchester United came under the spotlight again this week after posts placed on Instagram by the controversial France star.

Across Manchester, Guardiola has his own issues with social media and off-field behaviour after admitting he had to remind Benjamin Mendy of his responsibilities when the City defender arrived late for treatment to an injury last Sunday.

Mendy, who has now missed City's last four games, has a bruised metatarsal in his foot, yet the France international posted photographs of himself late last Saturday at Anthony Joshua's title fight at Wembley in London.

Guardiola confirmed he had no problem with Mendy travelling to London for the bout despite his injury.

But the Spaniard is clearly frustrated by Mendy's absence after he missed nearly all of last season with a cruciate knee ligament injury. "I don't know (when he will return). I think soon, but I don't know," Guardiola said. "When a guy comes here and is injured for seven months or arrives here and plays two or three games and after one month is injured, it's always a problem.

"It's always a problem to be involved in the way we want to play and the meetings and correcting mistakes. That's why it's so important. Hopefully this injury can be the last." *AFP*

Sarri urges 'genius' Hazard to become world's best

ONDON - Maurizio Sarri has hailed Eden Hazard as a "genius", but the Chelsea manager warned the Belgian star to work with even more intensity if he wants to be the world's best player.



"We had a very good group today and I must say that the spring tour was a success. Having started at Mhlume and spreading to other places around




