

2 killed in Mehlwabovu horrific accident

TWO men were killed in a horrific road accident yesterday morning along the Mehlwabovu road, MR 9 at the Yith'Abantu Highway.

It is said police found compressed dagga, weighing almost 50kg in the boot of the car which the two were trav-

The street value of this high grade could rake between E300 000 to E500

The Mazda sedan the two men were travelling in was involved in a head on collision with another vehicle, a Ford Ranger, which had four occupants. However, the four were lucky to escape

unhurt, although the owner of the Ranger, who was a passenger, sustained serious injuries and is currently hospitalised.

The horrific accident is believed to have occurred just after 5am yesterday.

The sedan, it is said, was travelling from the Manzini direction while the Ford Ranger was from the Hlatikulu direction.

Collision

The collision happened at the sharp bend of the notorious Mehlwabovu road, when both vehicles collided with such an impact that led to both vehicles swinging and twisting before being flung out of the road.

The two who were killed are from an area known as Sigcineni under Mahlangatsha constituency.

Their vehicle was a complete write-

off and it proved an impossible mission to retrieve their bodies from the wreckage. It was during this period that police noticed that there was a dagga consignment in the boot of the car.

The owner of the car works in the Free State mines in South Africa.

According to sources, the Ford Ranger was from Ntshanini, where the owner had driven to fetch one of the passengers, believed to be employed by him as a domestic worker.

Police mouthpiece Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that there was a head-on collision along the MR9 Road near Mehlwabovu, which resulted in two occupants of a sedan being killed on the spot, while occupants of the Ford Ranger all survived.

Supt Vilakati confirmed that com-

Cabinet's E3 million directive irks PAC

THE Chairperson of the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) MP Phila Buthelezi has slammed Cabinet for issuing a directive that E3 million be handed to three non-governmental organisations.

The chairperson said this showed that Cabinet was now running the Executive through directives, even in the absence of instruments that would enable them to effect transactions that involved huge amounts of money.

This transpired during yesterday's sitting, where the finance ministry appeared before the PAC and represented by the PS Bheki Bhembe.

The ministry of finance deposited E3 million into the ministry of commerce, industry and trade and further directed the commerce ministry to give the E3 million to three non-government organisations (NGOs).

The commerce ministry was to give E2 million to Eswatini Beverages to implement the KickStart programme. Junior Achievement and Enactus received E500 000 each. This was done without a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) signed between the said organisations and the government. Buthelezi said he now understood why the country found itself in this dire economic situation. He told Bhembe and other officials in the House that there was no way the economy could survive under such circumstances, where

Civil servant gets over E1m car

A civil servant benefitted from government's generosity during the 2018/19 financial year.

This was after an order was issued to the effect that this unidentified civil servant be bought a car worth over

This was said yesterday when the ministry of finance appeared before the Public Accounts Committee (PAC) in the House of Assembly. The name of the civil servant has not been revealed, as the matter is still to be audited by the auditor general (AG).

Details surrounding the person who issued the directive were also not revealed.

PAC Chairperson Phila Buthelezi told Ministry of Finance PS Bheki Bhembe that he was aware of such a matter as he was also informed about such a development.

He said more details would be revealed after Auditor General (AG) Timothy Matsebula had compiled his report for 2019.

tive from Cabinet, which was issued after the ministries had presented a budget to Cabinet.

He said this procedure was normal because Cabinet was allowed to make some changes in the budget, as it was part of the formulation of the budget.

He further said the Ministry of Commerce, Industry and Trade Principal Secretary (PS) Siboniso Nkambule was the one who was supposed to ensure all instruments were in place before the money was transferred to the NGOs. He made an example of Ministry of Agriculture PS Bongani Masuku, whom he said also encountered a similar situation, but never wanted to transfer the money to another organisation without proper documentation. Bhembe told the PAC that such duties were delegated to all the principal secretaries because they trusted one another.

Revenue offices reject Rands

THE civil servants working in government revenue offices are reported to be rejecting South African Rands as a form of pay-

This transpired yesterday during the ministry of finance's appearance before the Public Accounts Committee (PAC). The revenue officers are said to be rejecting notes of the South African Rands and Emaswati were made to run helter-skelter, looking for Emalangeni so that their payments could be accepted by the revenue officers.

PAC Chairperson Phila Buthelezi wondered why such a thing was happening, because the Rand notes were allowed to circulate in the country.

He made an example of the Road Transportation Board (RTB) offices in Mbabane, saying Emaswati were made to look for Emalangeni notes before they could access services in those offices.

Buthelezi further urged the ministry of finance to consider the working hours of the revenue offices, saying 3pm was not a good time at which the offices could close. He said he understood that in other instances, the offices closed to services the people who had formed lines inside the offices, so that by 5pm, they would have finished so that they could close for business.

However, Buthelezi was of the view that 4pm would still be suitable for the revenue officers because they could still meet their target of finishing at 5pm.

He said the revenue offices were very important, because they generated revenue for government. It did not make sense to allow Emaswati

to pay because officers wanted to close.

Manzini Region MP Busisiwe Mavimbela expressed concern about the poor level of customer care at the revenue offices and other government offices. She said the officers were rude and did not know how to treat customers, who brought money into government, through services rendered by the government. She called on government authorities to ensure that government was run like business entities, which gave quality services and raked in profits at the end of the

Investigate

In response, Accountant General (AG) Dumsile Ngwenya promised to investigate the rejection of South African Rands, because according to her knowledge, they accepted the Rand notes, but they did not accept the South African coins. The AG is the one in charge of the revenue offices, as her office is responsible for collecting government

She said they still experienced challenges in the revenue offices. The challenges included the long queues and the occasional internet break-down, which affected their service delivery. She further stated that they could not move away from closing at 3pm because they had to balance their accounts at the end of each business day. Another challenge was the safety of the revenue officers.

The officers dealt with money on a daily basis, so they were targets of criminals, who would want the money. It was better for them to close while people were still around to go back with the money they had town, running their errands.

SRA explains failure to provide documents

THE Eswatini Revenue Authority (SRA) says the failure to provide documents to supports the E330 million outstanding revenue was because of miscommuni-

The miscommunication was between the SRA and Auditor General (AG) Timothy Matsebula.

This was said by SRA Commissioner General Dumisani Masilela yesterday when he appeared before the PAC. Masilela said the AG had asked for the documents from the side of the accountant general

If the auditor general had approached the SRA, he would have understood why the documents were not there. Masilela said their accounts as SRA were very busy and the details of their clients would change on a regular basis. Another challenge was that they would not be in a position to disclose details about their clients (especially those who owed taxes) to other parties because that was against their policy.

Masilela further said the auditor general was free to access their documents. In fact, SRA specifically asked to be audited by the auditor general so that he could understand how SRA worked and how the AG could access their information.

The AG raised a concern over lack of supporting documents of E332 535 660, which was declared as recovered from SRA by the accountant general as at March 31, 2017. The recovered amount was said to be partial payment of accumulated outstanding revenue amounting to E3 519 802 140, leaving a balance of E3 187 266

Lost govt assets should be reported - PAC

LOST government assets should be reported to the losses committee by the principal secre-

This was said by the Public Accounts Committee (PAC), which was advising Ministry of Finance PS Bheki Bhembe on how money belonging to government could be saved. Lobamba MP Alan Stewart said reporting of lost or damaged properties was important because it impacted on government's decision on how money was to be used. He further said this was impor-

tant because it would alleviate tendencies of other government officials, who took government cars with them to keep them at home. Stewart said it was important for government to save money and use it where necessary, like implementing the Cost of Living Adjustment (CoLA).

ROT IN JAIL!

...Dad jailed 32 years for raping his 2 daughters

A kombi driver has been sentenced to 32 years for raping his two daughters.

*Sabelo (32) from Mbekelweni was taken to task on allegations that he sexually violated his two daughters; *Sakhi (11) and Noma (12). The rape is said to have started in 2014 up until 2017 for the youngest daughter while the eldest was last abused in 2015.

The two minors informed Manzini Principal Magistrate David Khumalo, who presided over the matter, that their father started abusing them while their step-mother was sleeping in one of the rooms of the house they shared in Ngwane Park.

The youngest survivor, Sakhi, recalled that one night back in 2014 her father returned from work and entered the room that she, Noma and their half-brother shared. Sakhi said the accused first moved their half-brother who was about five years at the time, from the bed that they slept on before he ordered her to remove her underwear.

Sakhi said Sabelo would rape her and when she cried she would order her to keep quiet.

After the encounter, it was alleged that Sabelo would first go to the bathroom to clean himself up before proceeding to the bedroom that he shared with his partner.

According to the minor, the accused would occasionally rape her at any time of the day, sometimes when her step-mother was at work.

In addition, it was alleged that before committing the offence, Sabelo would send his eldest daughter, Noma, to the shops before sexually violating Sakhi.

As if that was not enough, it was alleged that Sabelo would tell his youngest daughter to come up with an excuse to return home while on their way to school with Noma. Upon her return, Sakhi said her father would lock the door and repeatedly rape her before giving her E5. She alleged that Sabelo would advise her not to tell anyone about her ordeal.

At one instance, the children's step-mother allegedly caught the accused red-handed and they were involved in a bad quarrel.

Although she was afraid, Sakhi reportedly informed her sister Noma about her ordeal only for Noma to tell her that she had also suffered the same at the hands of their father. Still, Noma advised her sibling not to tell anyone because of the fear that their predicament would become public knowledge.

Abuse

Narrating her side of the story, Noma further informed the court that her father started abusing her in 2014, and that the instances were almost the same as her sister's.

"He told me that he was raping me because he wanted to take away bad omens such as poor performance at school," Noma informed the court.

She said although the abuse later stopped in 2015, she would still witness her father raping Sakhi, especially during the night.

It was in 2017 that the two minors decided to walk from Ngwane Park to Matsapha where their biological mother resided. They are said to have reported their predicament to her and further told her that they no longer wanted to return to live with their father.

Sabelo was sentenced to 15 years without an option of a fine for the rape of each of his daughters. An additional two years without an option of a fine was issued for a charge where he allegedly escaped from custody after being arrested.

Minister, portfolio committees tour ICT parastatals

THE Minister of Information, Communication and Technology Princess Sikhanyiso yesterday noted a need for local content broadcasting.

The minister spoke during her tour of the different government parastatals under her ministry. She was accompanied by portfolio committee members from both the Senate and House of Assembly.

The ICT minister toured Eswatini Communications Commission (ESC-COM), Eswatini Television Authority (ETVA) and Eswatini Broadcasting and Information Services (EBIS). The minister said over 80 per cent is generated externally, hence the need for an inventory and the challenges expressed were an excuse not a reason for not delivering local content. This will also create jobs as most youth is not employed. People will be empowered and empower others in the long run.

The ICT minister said most Emaswati are financially challenged and partnership with relevant stakeholders could help towards achieving digital migrations and content produced in Eswatini. She made an example of how she once recorded a state-of-the-art music video in ETVA studios. However, the minister commended EBIS for promoting Eswatini's culture and what the county is about. She was also impressed with the young women at the TV station, encouraging them to benefit from working with the CEO Bongani Dlamini,

who has vast experience.

"A certain ambassador said the problem with this nation is that we build infrastructure first before starting the business. By the time the business has to operate, running costs are way above because of loans."

Populace

She said through the same technology used by local stations, content can be created with limited penetration though due to the lesser populace.

The minister also commended ESC-COM for a job well done, noting that the commission was not even 10 years old. She said she patiently awaits the time when the commission will be operating from its own building.

She mentioned the need for cyber security and intellectual property as important, saying that many people own certain creations but do not get the money for the work. She said through VELA registration, they would know the exact

number of people that use service providers.

"Sir Richard Branson says 'train people well enough so that they can live and treat them well enough so they don't want to leave'," the minister said, reminding management at ESCCOM that workers welfare is important.

ESCCOM Chief Executive (CE) Mvilawempi Dlamini said as a commission, their key focus areas are making sure that the environment is conducive for competition such that the customers get the best deal.

He added that their work entails regulating and licensing all services in the telecommunications industry.

"We manage frequency spectrum, facilitate development of different sectors, including e-Commerce, protect rights of service consumers, manage competition and regulate prices. ESC-COM ensures compliance with licensing activities," Dlamini said.

'Minister relevant for ministry'

ESWATINI Television Authority (ETVA) Board Chairperson Carol Ngcobo said ICT Minister Princess Sikhanyiso was relevant and rightful person for the position bestowed by His Majesty the King on her.

This is because the minister had specialised in this field.

Ngcobo was thanking the minister for touring the parastatals, saying the minister would share her expertise in improving the ministry.

"We are sure that your enlightenment will transcend to broadcasting stations speeding up His Majesty's vision 2022. As a youthful minister, we are certain that you will look into youth employment. We are happy that you will see first-hand the challenges faced by us as we carry out our duties," she said.

ICT ministry portfolio committee Chairperson Manzini North MP Macford Sibandze echoed Ngcobo, saying the minister oozed optimism. He was confident that the minister will deal with issues as long as the relevant officials divulge everything to her. "The minister radiates energy as she is still young, energetic and innovative. We request cooperation from you. SABC has overtaken us but they learnt from us as SABC is post-1994. We have all the academic and intellect here as broadcasters have trained in different countries of the world. So let us work towards matching or even be better as we have deep seated industry knowledge,"

Senator Temple wants stations commercialised

CHAIRPERSON of the ICT portfolio committee in the Senate, Senator Mike Temple wants the broadcasting stations to be commercialised.

He urged that they should have a vision for the industry so the stations must be in profit making groups.

He promised that as a portfolio committee, they would help where possible towards achieving this. Senator Temple said commercialising these parastatals would bring more income as they will be able to charge more even for adverts.

"Right now you all have the lowest advertising rates. If this comes to pass then you will be able to be at par with the market rates and make your own profits which will enable you to take care of some expenses."

The portfolio committee is here to help you," the senator said.

Challenges in the broadcasting stations

BOTH ETVA and EBIS representatives freely expressed challenges facel when doing their work.

ETVA Board Chairperson Carol Ngcobo said there is a need for the minister to take note of the fact that the board is still incomplete.

She also said their employees need to further their studies so as to keep up with the growing technology changes.

"To see and feel is better than being told. We are happy that you are here and you will see for yourself the challenges faced. You will see the current situation and with the advice from the portfolio committees determine what we need for digital immigration to be implemented. Normally when a visi-

tor is coming, dirt'is swept under the mat but we will bear it all," Ngcobe said.

EBIS Director Martin Dlamini said they faced a number of challenges as a station which was almost 50 years old. Dlamini said their engineering department cannot reach some areas of the country because the equipment is old.

Wish

Dlamini also expressed his wish for the station to be considered as an essential service.

He requested that government come to their rescue.

News Editor at ETVA Setsabile Sibisi said they had the same challenges when it came to equipment. She said it has

become obsolete such that they fail to interphase with the studio.


MP said the biggest global investment in any organisation is moral of the staff. He said most expensive technological equipment can be bought but if the staff morale is very low, it would be pointless as it would be abused.

ICT Minister Princess Sikhanyiso encouraged businesses to start projects on renewable energy as it would help generate electricity for the transmitters that are currently not working.

She also encouraged MPs to pass laws that would be investor friendly; saying that as much as there should be scrutiny but the requirements become too much at times.

'Online news difficult to navigate in Eswatini

NEWSPAPERS will be a thing of the past, especially for the generation that is internet oriented.

This was expressed by the United States of America Ambassador to Eswatini Lisa Peterson during a World Press Freedom Day event organised by the Eswatini Editors Forum.

The ambassador said that currently, people are have difficulties navigating the Kingdom of Eswatini's online presence.

The event was held at the Mountain Inn Hotel yesterday.

Peterson made an example of the difficulty in accessing archived stories from the country's print media, using this to outline how the media needs to stay relevant to the generation that iss internet savvy. She said it was hard to find archived stories presently.

The coming generation is very keen internet and they want to read news through their screens. It is the responsibility of every media house to ensure that articles are archived well online so that the next generation will have easy access and be well informed on issues that are occurring in the current times," she said.

Peterson said many countries have online version of newspapers or broadcast their news online and were accessible.

Meanwhile, Embassy of the Republic of China (Taiwan) Second Secretary David Lin shared the same sentiments, stating that the young generation, particularly in the rural areas, depended on the internet to be updated on current issues.

He emphasised the need for an improved online

presence for the mainstream media.

Peterson also spoke about the impact of the withdrawal of the country's eligibility for benefits under the African Growth and Opportunity Act (AGOA) in January 2015. AGOA is a preferential trade programme that offers duty free access to the US market for products from eligible countries in Sub-Saharan Africa. Eswatini had been given until May 15 2014 to conform to its international agreements on labour and human rights, but failed to do so. However, current US President Donald Trump restored trade benefits to the country in December 2017.

She said companies like Ngwenya Glass continued to import their goods to the US even after the country had been withdrawn from AGOA, but they had to pay the duty and it was impacting greatly on their returns. But now that the trade benefits were restored, companies have more in terms of returns.

The US ambassador further advised the media to report positively on the gains the country has ng on the one narrative, highlighting the Public Order Act of 2017 as a significant improvement for the country.

"It doesn't feel like people have moved from 2015: Seemingly we are still stuck in previous occurrences, particularly that saw journalists facing time in prison for certain articles. As journalists, we need to step out of the talk about selfcensorship.

The media has to be outgoing and it has to be adventurous, but that is not the case in the country. As journalists, it should not be about publishing the paper in order to sell but but it must be publishing for the interest of readers, therefore, publishing the whole story with details," she said.

Serial rapist ripped my private parts - victim

STORIES BY SANDILE NKAMBULE High Court

A girl who was allegedly raped by the Mozambican man who stands accused of raping 17 teenage girls has detailed in court how her perpetrator ripped her private parts.

The Mozambican serial rapist allegedly raped the girls within the capital city.

The survivor said she was raped by the suspect, through both her private parts, leaving them ripped in the process.

Carlos Nhabome yesterday appeared before Judge Mbutfo Mamba for his trial at the High Court, where all his 17 counts of rape were put to him by Principal Crown Counsel Lomvula Hlophe.

According to the indictment, the accused person committed the offences in a thick forest near The Clinic, as he lured some of his victims to believe that a nurse

allegedly employed at The Clinic was looking for a maid, who would baby-sit her baby. One of the complainants was yesterday led in evidence by Hlophe, and she gave a heart-breaking detail on how the monster repeatedly raped

Accused

According to *Sonto, she had gone to Pick n Pay to purchase some groceries when the accused touched her on her back, and stopped her, asking if she was school going or not. She told the court that in response, she told the accused that she was not schoolgoing and that is when the accused informed her that a certain nurse at The Clinic was desirous of hiring a main, who would babysit her baby, and that they should proceed to the nurse. The unsuspecting Sonto, eager to secure the job, agreed to go to the nurse and when they reached The Clinic, the cunning suspect changed tune,

and claimed the nurse had knocked off duty for the day and that they should proceed to her house.

Using what he called a shortcut to the nurse's place of abode, the suspect led the 17-year-old Sonto to a thick forest near The Clinic, and once they were in the pockets of the forest, he produced a knife grabbed her, strangled her and threatened to kill her if she dare made noise and further ordered her to strip her clothes off before proceeding to rape her repeatedly.

After the ordeal, the suspect left the scene and Sonto paved her way to a nearby homestead, where she sought help and related her ordeal before the police were called and she was taken to the Mbabane Government Hospital for medical examination. She told the Court that after some days, she spotted the suspect at Sidvwashini, and immediately alerted members of the public before police were called.

APPEARING in person, Carlos Nhabome, who stands accused of allegedly raping the 17 teenage girls, pleaded not guilty to all 17 counts.

When the charges were put to him by Principal Crown Counsel Lomvula Hlophe, Carlos, who preferred to use his native language, pleaded not guilty.

Interpreter Mandlanzi did the translation from Siswati to Shangaan, likewise from Shangaan to Siswati, and as the accused stood in the accused dock, he would indicate that he pleads not guilty to each of the counts read to him.

Dressed in a cream white

He pleads not guilty to all 17 counts of rape

shirt and khaki jacket, the that he wanted them to assist suspect, who at times wore a smile, told the court that he understood each and every count that was read to him.

In all the 17 counts, he is alleged to have raped the girls, whose ages range between 11, 12, 13, 16, 17 and 19, with the eldest aged 20 within the capital

Some of the girls were preyed on while at the Mbabane Bus Rank, and lured into believing him in carrying his wife's bag, which had clothes for their newly-born baby at The Clinic, and that he would pay them for carrying the bags for him.

Some of the girls were made to believe that they would secure employment, and one of the girls was ordered to take a bath in a river after the rape ordeal, but she refused and ran to a nearby homestead, where she sought help.

Serial rape suspect fails to cross examine survivor, matter postponed

THE serial rape suspect Carlos Nhabome yesterday failed to cross-examine the first complainant in the matter, forcing the court to postponed the trial.

This, after the first complainant *Sonto had impressively gave an account of what happened on day and now s he positively identified the accused person. After she had given evidence, Judge Mbutto Mamba informed the suspect that it was now his turn to cross-examine the witness, and a tongue-tied Carlos requested the court to give him more time to prepare for the crossexamination. Judge Mamba then postponed the matter to a later date, and indicated that the matter is allocated six days for all the witnesses to be paraded by the Crown. During cross-examination, the suspect was expect-

ed to pose questions to the complainant on what she had told the court, while led in evidence by the Crown.

Judge Mamba had indicated to him that during cross-examination, he should ask question based on what the complainant had said in court.

57 witnesses to be paraded by the Crown

ACCORDING to the indictment, the Crown is expected to parade a total of 57 witnesses and the matter has been allocated six days.

Amongst these witnesses are the 17 survivors, investigating officers, doctors, security guards and parents of the survivors, amongst others.

All these witnesses are to give detailed evidence on what transpired during the different occasions and their roles played in as far as the matter is concerned.

Yesterday, most of the witnesses had crammed the court waiting for their turn to be led in evidence, however, they were informed that the matter has since been postponed.

AN ex-convict who was sentenced and convicted for assaulting his girlfriend has claimed that he was sodomised and infected with HIV by another inmate.

He claimed he was sodomised twice at His Majesty's Correctional Services (HMCS) in Matsapha.

The alleged rape incidents occurred in November 2018 while the inmates were sharing a cell.

The rape survivor who showed this publication his positive HIV test results. claimed that his alleged rapist was an older and more violent inmate who was also arrested for the brutal assault of his younger brother in April 2018.

The rape ex-convict said the rapist had approached him countless times for sex, adding that he would sometimes touch his buttocks while other inmates laughed.

"At the time of my arrest, I was unemployed and I found out that my girlfriend was cheating on me with an Asian shop owner at Bulandzeni. I was arrested and sentenced to 20 months in a correctional facility if I I WAS SODOMISED, INFECTED HIVINJAIL-EX-INMAT

failed to pay a fine of E2 500. After my sentencing my extended family promised to raise the money quickly on my behalf. After a few interviews with correctional facility officers, I

was sent to a cell with two other inmates at the Pigg's Peak correctional facility," he said. He said while in the cell, his cellmates would talk about enjoying sodomy with other convicted prisoners.

"I arrived in the cell and spent two weeks while an older more violent inmate tried to discuss sodomy with me. A week after my arrival, the third inmate managed to pay his fine and he was removed from our cell. This is when I was stuck with the older inmate. During this time of seclusion at night, the first rape occurred," he

The rape survivor added that the rapist told him to remain silent during the rape ordeal to avoid drawing attention from other inmates.

"The second rape occurred a week after the first one. In both incidents, the perpetrator did not use a condom. I was then released as my grandmother paid my fine, I began going to church and I took an HIV test yesterday. To my shock I found out that I am now HIV positive," he added.

Meanwhile, HMCS Public Relations Officer Gugulethu Dlamini said the

rape survivor should report the incident to the police so that the rapist who is now a free man could be re-arrested

"The laws on rape are well documented so anybody who claims to have been raped while at the correctional facility should report that to the police as soon as possible.

Inmates

Correctional officers first interview all new inmates before assigning them to a cell with other inmates. Sometimes we will allow inmates who committed assaults to share cells with inmates who committed murder.

The reason is because assault sometimes leads to murder so the two inmates might have a common understanding. We also conduct mental evaluations on all inmates before placing them in the minimum security cells. The rape survivor should report the matter,"

Security guards vandalise employer's property

This was declared by Swaziland Amalgamated Trade Unions (SATU) Secretary General Frank Mncina on behalf of Guard Alert security guards.

This was during a protest action at Guard Alert Security Services premises in Manzini yesterday morning. While at it, the agitated security guards vandalised the company's gate which they found locked.

This was before they spilled garbage all over the premises to demonstrate their anger.

When addressing the employees, Mncina said war was first declared by the company when it refused to reinstate two shop stewards whom he said were unfairly dismissed from work.

Misconduct charges were levelled against the two guards but they were not called to a disciplinary hearing. This, according to SATU, was aimed at victimising the shop stewards and further oust the union. The unconditional reinstatement of the shop stewards was demanded by SATU in a petition that was delivered to the company's officials on April 16. Also contained in the same petition was that another shop steward was to attend a disciplinary hearing for allegedly absenting himself from work. In April, the said employee had gone to hospital and he produced genuine sick sheets to prove that he had consulted with health practitioners on the day he was away from work.

In yesterday's protest, the aim was to prevent a disciplinary hearing of the same employee that was scheduled for 9:30am.

Mncina informed the employees that after the petition was delivered in April, the agreement between the company officials and the union was that they would meet to discuss the issues on the following day. However, at the last minute, Mncina said the Guard Alert officials postponed the meeting. At a later stage, Mncina said a response to the petition was sent to the union through an email and it stated that the dismissed guards will not be recalled.

Decampaign

'This means we are going to decampaign the company and if needs be, we shall see to it that it shuts down," he said much to the agreement of the employees. As part of the decampaigning tactics, Mncina said all Guard Alert clients would be urged not to renew the company's contracts.

"The irrational manager asked what would happen to the guards when the company is closed." Answering this, Mncina said the guards' employment should be the least of Guard Alert managers' concern because the only people who would suffer from the closure of the company would be those in top management.





MAN RAPES MINOR, FLEES

A young man's one minute decision to commit the unthinkable, saw him facing the wrath of the law.

When 14 year old Phumlile* (not her real name) approached Mbongiseni Khumalo. who she trusted enough to call him her uncle, she did not know that he would violate her in the most traumatic manner.

It is said during the recent Easter holidays, Phumlile's aunt and legal guardian left for the Good Friday services in South Africa, leaving her behind with older nephews and nieces. As they resided in a compound without electricity, it was the norm that they would charge their phones at Khumalo's house.

On the day in question, Phumlile went to Khumalo's house to fetch her phone, which she had left charging overnight.

When she arrived, Khumalo invited her into his house to look for the said phone, which he said was still in the charger.

As she entered, Khumalo allegedly closed and locked the door behind her, with the intention to violate the young girl.

Khumalo is then said to have raped her, without the thought to protect his victim from HIV/AIDS and sexually transmitted infections. After Khumalo was done committing this offence, he is said to have locked the victim in his house and fled the scene.

This narrative was submitted by the victim's aunt on Tuesday on behalf of her niece, who appeared before the Mbabane Magistrate's Court during Khumalo's trial. Khumalo pleaded guilty to contravening the Sexual Offences and Domestic Violence Act, when he raped the minor with no conscience.

In his cross examination of the witness, Khumalo claimed that he was in a sexual relationship with the victim and denied any assault, although he pleaded guilty to the crime.

The trial will continue on June 18.

UN commends govt for strong commitment to health services

THE United Nations has commended government for its strong commitment to health

Government was hailed during the launch of the ninth African Vaccination Week held at Kwaluseni Inkhundla on Tuesday.

Speaking during the event, World Health Organisation (WHO) Representative Dr. Comelia Atsyor said the ninth anniversary of the African Vaccination Week aimed at taking stock of the importance of the vaccination programmes in the African region in combating life-threatening diseases, especially amongst children and the whole global community

It would also highlight the important role vaccination played in strengthening the health

Atsyor said the African Vaccination Week is a time to engage all members of society, including governments, political leaders, civil society and the private sector in giving high priority to vaccination.

On behalf of the UN, Dr Atsyor commended His Majesty King Mswati III and government for the strong commitment to health.

She said this goes to health in general and immunisation. Dr Atsyor said government had been in the forefront in the continuous financial commitment towards the purchase of all the needed childhood vaccines.

She said this is a feat that a few African countries were able to achieve. The WHO representative said this commitment would contribute towards the achievement of universal health coverage (UHC) in Eswatini.

Dr Atsyor said well-funded immunisation programmes were key to realising UHC target because they provide communities with the world's most cost-effective disease prevention tool and at the same time ensuring that the population could access other basic services in addition to immunisation when in contact with health facilities.

The WHO representative said although tried, tested, and safe vaccines are available, one in five children in Africa still do not receive all the necessary and basic vaccines.

She said this state of affairs predisposed unvac-of eradication polio in spite of several chalcinated children to diseases such as measles that can prove fatal or cause disability such as blindness.

Dr Aisyor said every year, vaccine-preventable diseases killed more than half a million children under five years of age in Africa, representing approximately more than half of the total deaths in the world, and yet it is shown that every dollar invested in vaccination yields approximately US\$41, which is equivalent to E586.91 in economic and social benefits.

The WHO representative said smallpox, one of the disfiguring diseases known to man, was eradicated through vaccination, providing huge savings and ending untold suffering and misery and likewise, the world is now on the verge lenges.

Dr Atsyor said declining vaccination coverage remained one of the major challenges in Eswatini. She said in 2018 about 6 000 children in Eswatini were not reached to be vaccinated.

She said there was need, therefore, to step up efforts in reaching all children with life-saving vaccines.

The WHO representative made a call on all stakeholders: government, development partners, including the UN, private organisations, political leaders, civil society organisations, community leaders and parents to increase all efforts to ensure that no child is left behind, unimmunised in Eswatini.

Soldier rejects E30 000, arrests suspect alleged dagga dealer

A member of the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) lived up to his oath when he refused to take a E30 000 bribe from an alleged dagga dealer, who wanted to evade arrest.

The soldier was keeping guard of a car which had been apprehended along the borderline when the dagga dealer Mthokozisi Nzima approached him and requested that he (soldier) should allow him to take the dagga that was inside, before the police could arrive and offered him the E30 000 bribe.

Arrested

However, upon turning down the bribe, Nzima drove off in another car before the police subsequently arrested him.

This is contained in an urgent application that was yesterday filed by the office of the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP), seeking an order for preservation of property, a three-bedroom house, VW Amarok and a Toyota Hilux belonging to Nzima, pending a forfeiture application.

Motivating the application in her affidavit, filed in the application that was before Judge Maxine Langwenya yesterday, Principal Crown Counsel Elsie Matsebula submitted that the property in question is proceeds of unlawful activity scheduled under the Prevention of Organised Crime Act (POCA) of 2018. She submitted that the property was pur-



chased using proceeds of unlawful activities, and that same is under the possession of Nzima, an adult Liswati of Mkhitsini area in the Shiselweni region.

Relating events that culminated to the present application, she submitted that on April 13, 2019 members of the Royal Eswatini Police Service (REPS) received information about a motor vehicle conveying dagga, travelling towards the borderline, and the police promptly contacted soldiers manning the border line to assist in searching for the vehicle, a VW Amarok grey in colour.

Upon spotting soldiers manning the borderline, the occupants of the vehicle abandoned the car at a certain homestead. "Whilst the soldiers were waiting for the arrival of the police, Nzima approached the soldier who was keeping guard of the vehicle, while driving another vehicle, the Toyota Hilux, and introduced himself as the owner of the VW and offered the E30 000 bribe if he allowed him to remove the dagga before the arrival of the police, which the soldier refused to take," she submitted.

Upon realising that the soldier was not giving in to his bribe, he quickly left the scene while the police rushed there.

ALSO filing a confirmatory affidavit was the investigating, Officer Detective Mandla Khumalo, who submitted that Mthokozisi Nzima is a well-known dagga deal-

In his car, 364 kg of the illegal herb and E10 760 was found and seized by the police upon searching the vehicle.

Khumalo, from the Nhlangano Drug Unit, confirmed the affidavit of the principal crown counsel in as far as it related to the evidence revealed by the investigators in the matter.

Nzima a well-known dealer, 364kg dagga, E10 000 cash seized - cops

He submitted that the vehicles in question are known to be those of Nzima, who is a well-known dagga dealer, and that while they were pursuing the VW Amarok together with detective Jabulani Mhlanga, they received information that the vehicle had been abandoned at a certain unknown homestead.

When the vehicle was found and searched, about five huge bags packed with dagga were found upon peeping through the windows, more dagga was seen since the doors were locked.

The vehicle was later towed to the police station and Nzima was called through his mobile phone and ordered to provide keys to the vehicle, as the police were intending breaking in and that is when two boys quickly came and provided the car keys which they claimed were spare keys.

CMAC wants review of law that bypasses them

THE Conciliation, Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC) wants Parliament to look into the law which allows concerned parties to bypass them and head straight to the Industrial Court. The law was passed by the previous Parliament.

CMAC Executive Director Nathi Gumede, speaking at the Federation of Swaziland Trade Unions (FESWATU) May Day on Wednesday at Bhunya Stadium, said workers must pray that Parliament amends the Industrial Relations Act 2000, to give CMAC power to do two things in the interest of the right of the workers.

According to the director, the enforcement powers to have sheriffs collect amounts that employers agree to pay at conciliation and compulsory arbitration for small claims that employers deprived of the power to frustrate workers by refusing to arbitration.

"Over 80 per cent of the matters that are not resolved at conciliation are currently settled in the Industrial Court simply because workers do not have the money to have their matter taken to court by

The minister noted that even if the matters are attended to in court, sometimes there are instances whereby the employee loses the court case, of which that particular person will not gain anything if he or she was supposed to be paid by a certain company," he said.

Gumede highlighted that arbitration could be a solution since workers would not pay as much as they have to pay when taking their matters to court.

He noted that employees get confused and stressed concerning this situation, adding that some of them lose their jobs because they have not won their cases. When some get back to work, there would be tension between the employer and the employee, and that will completely ruin the working relationship.

Asian shop owner releases more camera footage to police

OWNERS of the Swaziland Electronic Shop have released new camera footage of two criminals captured stealing cellphones and other items worth E77 500 to the police.

The initial surveillance footage was first released to the police on Sunday morning, two hours after criminals managed to break into the Well Pharmacy and the neighbouring electronic shop.

However, the new secondary footage was released to the police on Wednesday.

In the original footage, a single main camera was used, which partially concealed the criminal's faces. However, the second footage that

was recorded on another camera exposed the criminals' faces fully.

Businessman and owner of the electronic shop Adnan Butt said the camera footage would help the police make an arrest.

"I am hopeful that the new footage will help the police arrest the criminals. It is very unfortunate that such crime happens. No business person deserves to be put through so much stress.

Criminals

"These criminals stole all my cellphone stock worth about E60 000. In addition to that, they took other items from both my shop and the pharmacy that is located next door. It is important to mention that my shop has also suffered structural damage, because the criminals entered through the wall next door and then broke through my ceiling," he said.

Chief Police Information and Communications Officer Superintendent Phindile Vilakati confirmed that the surveillance footage was released to the police to aid ongoing investigations.

MENTALLY ILL SOLDIER'S SALARY ARREARS CLAIM EFERRED TO LAB

STORIES BY SANDILE NKAMBULE High Court

SHE was absent without leave (AWOL) from the Umbutfo Eswatini Defence Force (UEDF) and alleged she was undergoing treatment at the psychiatric hospital, and for that a soldier's E330 000 salary arrears claim has been referred to labour courts.

This effectively means that the soldier is at liberty of approaching the Conciliation Mediation and Arbitration Commission (CMAC) and the Industrial Court of Eswatini which deals with labour related matters.

The soldier Nkosingiphile Shongwe, who is based at the Phocweni Army Barracks, had filed an application at the High Court where she was seeking an order that the UEDF, which had been cited as the first respondent, be ordered to pay her the arrear salary for the months of January 2012 to March 2015 in the total sum of E329 271.09 within a period of 21 days.

The application was opposed by



the army on grounds that Shongwe went AWOL within this period but failed to substantiate her allegations that she was being attended to at the mental institution.

Although her mental condition is known within the army authorities as she has been in and out of the mental institution, the army argued that on the said dates, her whereabouts were not known. Handing judgment in the matter on Tuesday was Principal Judge Qinisile Mabuza who made no order on the substantive claim and noted that the applicant (Shongwe) has not taken the court into confidence by informing it where she was as she failed to show proof of where she was between the said

Judge Mabuza wondered as to where she was and what was she doing during this period and if she was indeed ill during this period. The judge further noted that Shongwe did not file any medical proof to that effect.

"How then can this court order that she be paid for this period? She resurfaced in January 2013 and after a day or two disappeared again until April 2015 when she resumed work. Because the applicant's services were not terminated, the appropriate forum for claiming payment of her salary arrears is the fora of labour matters.

The first respondent will provide proof of the days she was absent; in the circumstances I make no order on the substantive claim," Justice Mabuza ordered.

Judge Mabuza further noted that the then army commander Sobantu Dlamini had clarified in his affidavit that the applicant's services were not terminated but only her salary was stopped because of absenteeism, adding she was never charged for absenting herself.

Having noted this, Justice Mabuza was of the view that the court is not competent to grant the prayer sought by Shongwe in her notice of motion in the application.

Army superiors wanted her to retire on medical grounds

AN opinion that the applicant (Shongwe) should retire on medical grounds had been raised by one of her superiors.

In her papers filed before court, Shongwe had submitted that on or about 2005, she was recruited by the first respondent (UEDF) and became a private soldier within six months of training and thereafter was stationed at Phocweni Army Barracks where she was attached to the Royal Guard.

She stated that during the year 2008, she fell ill and was admitted for treatment at the National Psychiatric Hospital under the care of Dr Charum but was later discharged.

From 2008, she averred that she would be in and out of the mental hospital and during this time she was paid a full salary. However, when she fell again in 2012, her supervisor Major Ndlangamandla was of the opinion that she should retire on medical grounds and was sent back to the psychiatric hospital for re-evaluation for that purpose.

However

However, Dr Charum wrote a letter to her superiors stating that she was on treatment and should be allowed to come for review on a monthly basis. The doctor did not recommend retirement on medical grounds.

Judge Mabuza noted that the first respondent (EUDF), represented by the former army commander (Sobantu), did not deny the above background as set out by the applicant.

Dlamini, in his affidavit, had further stated that after the psychiatric evaluation, the doctor recommended that since the applicant was still young, retirement would exacerbate her mental illness and recommended that she be retained but given light duties. She was accordingly given light duties, hence she is still under the employ of the army at the Phocweni

'Salary should not have been unilaterally stopped without due process'

IN her further analysis in the judgment, Judge Mabuza noted that something was definitely wrong with the applicant that warranted putting into effect retirement proceedings on medical grounds but not to unilaterally stop her salary without due process.

in her evidence, the applicant stated that she resumed work in April 2015 and to her shock and disbelief her pay slip reflected she was entitled to net pay of E0.00.

Deductions

Judge Mabuza said it is important to note that the deductions for absenteeism span over the 28 Justice Mabuza observed that months the applicant says she was not paid and that the respondents cannot, therefore, be heard to say her claim has prescribed.

Stopped

The army commander in his affidavit had denied that the applicant's salary was stopped while she was sick but admitted that the salary was stopped due to the applicant's absence but does not specifically state why it was deducted and why her pay slip reflected E0.00:

Claimed

She had claimed E329 271.09 in respect of the salary arrears but the army commander in his response said there are no arrears due to her as the money deducted was because of absenteeism.

Applicant would at times run away from senior officers when fetched at home - UFDF

IN her judgement, Justice Mabuza further noted that evidence brought before court was to the effect that when the applicant's superiors tried to fetch the applicant from her parental homestead, she would run away from them and the senior officers would return to camp

empty handed.

According to a confirmatory affidavit filed by Lieutenant Gugu Zwane in support of that of the army commander, the applicant's salary was indeed stopped because of her long absence without reporting.

The court also noted that Lieutenant

Thobile Ndwandwe also confirmed that the applicant absented herself for several months without reporting her whereabouts and the reasons of her absence.

Informed

Both Lieutenants had informed the court that sometimes they would proceed to applicant's home in search for her but upon seeing them approaching, applicant would run away.

Observed

Justice Mabuza observed that it is clear from the evidence outlined that the applicant was ill, that her superiors knew her condition with rec-

ommendations that she retire on medical grounds and further that her erratic behaviour in absenting herself from work, running away upon seeing her superiors or even when her mother and brothers brought her to work whereupon she would disappear after a day or two.

2019/20 revenue set to reach E18.9 billion

THE country's revenue for the 2019/20 financial year is projected to reach E18.9 billion, marking an increase of about 17 per cent.

The increase is as a result of the proposed revenue policies that are envisaged to be implemented during the 2019/20 fiscal year.

This was revealed by Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) Governor Majozi Sithole during his presentation of the Annual Monetary Policy Statement at the Happy Valley Hotel yesterday.

He said while SACU receipts remained a relatively large contributor to government revenue, currently contributing 34 per cent of total revenue, SACU contributions to total revenue were on a downward trend as VAT and PAYE improve.

He said the increase in revenue would come from improvements in SRA domestic collections and the implementation of the new rev-

He added that the preliminary figures for the period ending February 2019 indicate that total public debt stood at E16.1 billion, an equivalent of 26.2 per cent of GDP.

He said this represented an increase of 42.5 per cent when compared to the opening position of E11.3 billion for the 2018/19 fiscal year.

"The increase in debt was mainly driven by the financing needs of government. During the period under review, domestic debt increased by 60.5 per cent from E6.1 billion to E9.8 billion.

"On the other hand, external debt increased by about 21 per cent from E5.2 billion to E6.3

This increase takes into account payments made to active loans, drawdowns made on project loans as well as valuation changes."

CBE working around the clock to improve reserves

CENTRAL Bank of Eswatini (CBE) Governor Majozi Sithole has assured the nation that they are working around the clock to improve the country's declining official gross reserves.

Making his presentation of the Annual Monetary Policy Statement at the Happy Valley Hotel yesterday, Sithole said the institution came up with a number of strategies to improve the declining reserves.

"The issue of reserves is a serious one and we are doing all we can to get them up again.

"We have, amongst other strategies, submitted some regulations to Parliament and are also conducting investigation and consultations with other international insti-

"The reserves also rely on the rand, hence the need for us to mon-



itor its flow," he said.

According to the statement, the gross official reserves declined by 31.2 per cent over the year ended March 2019 to reach E4.6 billion, compared to a high of E6.6 billion in March 2018.

The fall in reserves was largely attributed to lower SACU receipts during the 2018/19 fiscal year at

E5.8 billion compared to E7.1 billion during the 2017/18 fiscal year.

Accordingly, the reserves were enough to cover 2.0 months of imports, lower than 3.2 months recorded the previous year.

At this level, the import cover was below the internationally recommended level of three months.

It further mentioned that short to medium-term prospects for a turnaround in the reserves were positive as government's cash flow challenges may ease somewhat as SACU receipts for the 2019/2020 fiscal year are estimated to increase slightly.

Coupled with fiscal consolidation measures and the implementation of initiatives by the bank to boost the country's reserves, the position is expected to be better for 2019/20.

E'LL REDUCE BLACK TAX - MAIMANE

DA leader Mmusi Maimane says if black professionals don't put their faith in his party during next week's polls, they risk "exacerbating" the issue of black tax.

Black tax is a term coined to define financial support to extended family within black communities.

Maimane insists the DA, which is the largest opposition party in the country, is the only real alternative that can help revive South Africa's ailing economy and build a capable state.

While some young professionals remain undecided about who to vote for, others believe it can never be the DA, due to its historical background and a deep belief that the party does not put black communities and their struggles at the fore-

Maimane, who hails from Dobsonville, Soweto, told News24 in an interview ahead of the May general elections that he could relate to the black tax issue.

"If we don't have this vision of putting a job in every home, of building a capable state then this issue of black tax will be exacerbated even more, as more people join the ranks of unemployment," said Maimane.

In giving his observations to this continued stance against his party, Maimane said he did not believe some professionals had a proper look at the work the DA has done in the government and in fighting corruption.

"I also have great sympathy for

many professionals who find themselves in centres of work they come in and they say: 'Actually, at this place of work I am overlooked because of our historical injustices.' or Tve got a PA of a different race, who earns more money than me yet I am much more professional than

Maimane insists the DA, which is the largest opposition party in the country, is the only real alternative that can help revive South Africa's ailing economy and build a capable state


them," said Maimane.

"I think as the DA we've been misunderstood in believing that what we've got to do is build places that are diverse. We've got to ensure we build this dream of one South Africa for all," he said, adding that there was a need to address inequality, and inequality borne out of race.

GOVT REDUCES PUBLIC DEBT TO E2 BILLION

MINISTER of Finance Neal Rijkenberg says government has taken great strides in reducing the country' E3.5 billion in unpaid bills.

Responding to questions posed during the presentation of the Annual Monetary Policy Statement by Central Bank of Eswatini (CBE) Governor Majozi Sithole at the Happy Valley Hotel yesterday, the minister said government had put in place a number of initiatives to reduce the E3.5 billion unpaid bills, which contributes to depleting the reserves.

"We were E3.5 billion in arrears, but government has managed to reduce the debt by E1.5 billion taking it to E2 billion.

"Clearing these arrears will also help us as a country in building our reserves," he said.


...Minister says cleared debt will have positive impact on gross reserves

The minister explained that the money was being kept in many sectors, including parastatals that he said were failing to pay taxes, utility companies, as well as government ministries.

"We have a situation of invoices languishing in the drawers and ministries are the main culprits in that. We currently have a clean-up process to ensure strong diligence in budget spending in all the ministries.

"Ministries found to have overspent in budgeting will be seriously taken to task and we are quite positive that this will be effectively done," he said.

The minister added that this would also have a positive impact in the country's gross domestic product ratio.



Stop overcharging government - Majozi

CENTRAL Bank of Eswatini (CBE) Governor Majozi has appealed to the corporate sector to desist from overcharging government.

The governor stated this during the Annual Monetary Policy Statement held at the Happy Valley Hotel yesterday, saying it was essential for the country's procurement system to be monitored as compa-

nies tended to charge government ridiculous prices. "We tend to overcharge government even for small things and that is not helping you. We need to have our procurement system controlled so we can avoid such corrupt processes. "When it comes to corruption, most of us think government when even the private sector is corrupt," he said. On another note, Sithole called for the need of lifestyle audits in the country, and that this would help the country fight corruption. "Some of us are rich, but our assets don't translate to the taxes we pay hence the need for these lifestyle audits. "Let us pay our taxes and also support these institutions fighting corruption, as well as government,"

(LUCT), Gwamile Vocational Training Institute Matsapha (VOCTIM) as well as Ngwane Park Youth and Training Centre (NPYTC).

All ENACTUS teams across participating institutions were expected to initiate entrepreneurial ideas and business solutions with passion and innovation for sustainable impact to beneficiary communities. To catalyse the process, students, academic and business leaders will collaborate to create a better world through their projects.

ENACTUS Country Director Wonderboy Khumalo highlighted that the ENACTUS model emphasised team-oriented events that created a sense of accountability and motivation for teams to continually improve the quality of their projects.

"This approach also provided an opportunity for collaboration and best-practice sharing, further strengthening the value of the learning experience and the overall effectiveness of the programme," he said.

Meanwhile, Zothile Mabusela, Kushamiri Director of Human Capital Development, said it was fundamental for entrepreneurship programmes to be more intentional about developing leaders.

She noted that too often entrepreneurs were consumed by their business ideas and took the issue of leadership for granted, which was almost 100 per cent about managing people. "Initiating great concepts and creating a strategic vision won't get entrepreneurs very far if the rest of the team isn't willing to follow the leader or if individuals don't appreciate their responsibilities and contributions to the team," she said.

Supported

Her sentiments were supported by Carla Dos Santos, Director of Industrial Psychology. She emphasised that managing an entrepreneurial project required solid leadership and not all these skills were obvious to entrepreneurs.

She said the training was an opportunity for probing teamwork dynamics and utilising psychometric assessments to sharpen the team's leadership capabilities.

The Kushamiri training addressed topics such as leadership (personal leadership style and impact on others), differences between management and leadership, emotional intelligence, managing change as well as communication, among others.

Massive security forces deployment ahead of May 8

'Stop spoiling ministers with freebies while workers suffer'

including the bloated Cabinet and ministers' state-sponsored cars and houses. Malema said the EFF would end this waste and the special treatment of ministers

who earn salaries but have their entire livelihoods funded by the

"These ministers are working, so let them buy their own houses and own cars. Someone says 'but it is only for five years' and I say to that let us have a state-owned bank which will have a special bond for ministers. Let us not spoil these people," said Malema.

"Why are ordinary workers going to work carrying lunchboxes but ministers get state-funded catering where they work. This must end. these people must also carry lunchboxes, even if it contains mopane worms it is none of our business.

"Why should there be state-funded for ministers and MPs when they earn food from home to eat there in Parliament because they are workers like everyone else."

Malema said the Cabinet is currently bloated. He then pointed out departments he believes should close shop completely and be merged

with those that have a similar function.


Malema said the department of communications and telecommunications must cease to exist and be incorporated into the presidency. Moreover, Malema

believes the department of science and technology should be put together with that of higher education and training, while sport and recreations should be merged with arts and culture.

"So we must close science and technology and send Naledi Pandor straight to an old-age home because there will be one department called higher education," said Malema.

'Something inherently dangerous about ANC, EFF coalition'



CAPE TOWN - DA leader Mmusi Maimane says no good can come from a coalition between the EFF and the ANC and insists that the EFF must be investigated in connection with claims that the party benefited from the collapse of VBS Mutual Bank.

Maimane made the comments during an interview with News24, during which he defended his party's posters, which urged voters to keep the ANC and EFF out of the Western Cape.

The DA currently enjoys majority control of the province and is seeking a fresh mandate, despite a series of political blunders and controversies over the past year, including a clash between the party and former Cape Town mayor Patricia de Lille over her role in both the party and the city. "I do

think there would be something inherently dangerous about a coalition between the ANC and EFF. Once you get to those issues (the VBS allegations), then the amendment of the Constitution around Section 25 becomes possible, which is equally dangerous from where I sit," Maimane said.

"We are in an election here! Therefore, I must maximise how many voters turn up and must make them aware of the worries and the dangers that could come on board," he said, as he defended his party's position. The DA leader seemed to struggle to explain why the EFF, which is in a working partnership with his party, deserved to be kept out of the Western Cape but remained good enough to work with in two of Gauteng's metros - Johannesburg

and Tshwane.

He said he believed the EFF needed to be investigated for 'strong' allegations that its leaders and the party received money from VBS bank

"What must we do? Say it's the EFF - I must remain hush hush and keep quiet? No! there is a principle here and it must be applied across (the board), and if there were allegations of corruption against the DA, they must also be investigated," said Maimane. "You're either principled or not principled. Principle is this, no matter what the arrangement is, if you are corrupt, you are corrupt and we must stand up. It doesn't matter who it is," the leader of South Africa's largest opposition party continued.

No end in sight to rising petrol price pain

JOHANNESBURG -Analysts have warned of further fuel price increases in coming months

Crude oil reached its highest level since November, after the US decided to end a sanctions waiver on Iranian oil imports. The price rose to more than US\$70 (about R1,011) a barrel compared with US\$54.11 (about R782) at the start of the year. The inland price of 95 unleaded petrol is now R16.67 and 93 unleaded is R16.50. At the coast, the prices are R16.03 for 95 unleaded and R16.07 for 93 unleaded. It's the fifth straight increase in fuel prices in 2019 and the second-highest fuel price on record, after prices peaked at R17.08 in October 2018.

Analysts have warned that the rising price of Brent crude oil and the weaker exchange rate will lead to further fuel price increases in coming months. TMG Digital

EFF is party trusted the most - IPSOS

Cape Town - It's the battle of the polls, as early indicators try to get a heads-up on who will ultimately end up as the victor after the May 8 general elections.

According to a new poll by global market researcher IPSOS, the EFF is the party trusted the most.

The EFF scored 93 per cent on the trust barometer, while the ANC and DA's numbers have dwindled to 85 per cent and 87 per cent. "This clearly shows that the ANC is no longer a dominant electoral force, but despite their support shrinking, they will remain in power.

"Young people are the bulk of the EFF's support because they like the radicalism and populism of the party," said Dr Ntsikelelo Breakfast from the school of Security and Africa Studies at Stellenbosch University.

He said many people believed that the EFF could bring change quickly, "Political parties have suffered massive blows over the year. The DA in the Western Cape suffered a blow of how they treated Patricia de Lille, and it portraved a party that used a coloured woman for votes, Breakfast said. Trust in the EFF has grown substantially over the years. In November 2017 it had 81 per cent While the ANC had 72 per cent and the DA 87 per cent. Political analyst Ralph Mathekga said: "This has 8 lot to do with the EFF's showing in Parliament. Timeslive





Another data price hike shock for Zimbabweans

HARARE- Mobile data price increases in Zimbabwe are a blow to start-up companies, media outlets and ordinary users, with a third mobile company now hiking its rates.

Government-owned Net One with a subscriber base of just over three million in early April hiked its charges after getting approval from the Postal and Telecommunications Regulatory Authority of Zimbabwe. Telecel, another mobile operator in Zimbabwe, followed suit.

However, a shock for many came this week when Econet, with 11,4 million subscribers, effected a 150per cent hike. Already, according to a report by Cable - an organisation that tracks mobile and broadband services globally - Zimbabwe's data is more expensive than all countries in sub-Saharan Africa with a gigabyte costing more than \$70.

"It's bad for many businesses that rely on digital marketing and newspaper companies that have

employed digital strategies in a fast-paced information communication world. The world is now digital, new business models are platform based, but high data charges limit access to the platforms," said Harare social media expert John Mokwetsi.

The internet has been useful in the country's social fabric. Just recently, various groups used social media to crowdsource funds to help Cyclone Idai victims in Chimanimani in March. For the politically conscious, the hike is a direct attack on their freedom to access information at a time when they feel mainstream media products are compromised.

"I belong to a political group where we discuss how the economy should be fixed but at this rate, we will have less people going online," said Tendai Ncube, who identified himself as a Zanu-PF supporter. Ncube added that it's bad enough for him in the capital city, but it could be worse for rural folk, where the majority of Zimbabweans reside. "I work for a living but my grandmother or cousins who rely on me for data will have to scale down. This means they will not have access to news as much as they had in recent times," he added.

But just like other business entities that rely on foreign currency, mobile operators feel the pinch as the local ZWL is losing ground against major currencies. *Timeslive*

Oil and govt workers freed in Nigeria

ABUJA - Two Shell oil and four government emergency workers kidnapped in Nigeria's restive oil-rich south in two separate attacks last week have been freed, police said Wednesday.

The Royal Dutch Shell oil workers, whose nationalities were not released, were abducted on Thursday in Nigeria's southern Rivers state, the latest in a long line of attacks in a region where kidnapping for ransom is rife.

In that attack, gunmen ambushed their convoy by opening fire at the guards to stop the vehicles, killing two policemen.

The Shell workers were freed six days later on Tuesday, said Rivers State police spokesperson, Nnamdi Omoni.

"The two oil workers who were abducted by a gang of hoodlums last week have both been rescued from their abductors," Nnamdi said Wednesday. Their rescue was "facilitated by the gallant efforts" of the police tactical team, Nnamdi said, but gave no further details.

In a separate case, four government workers from Nigeria's National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA), three men and a woman, were also freed, NEMA regional chief Walson Brandon said.

"They have been released and we are now in the hospital with them for medical attention," Brandon said. They were freed on Wednesday, a week after being abducted. A fifth NEMA staff member was shot in the leg during the attack, as he ran to successfully evade capture. Reuters

Holiday isle left in ruins by Cyclone Kenneth

MAPUTO-From the air, Ibo Island on the Quirimbas Archipelago off Mozambique's north-east coast, was speckled with flattened homes and water-logged farmland, testament to the destructive force of Cyclone Kenneth.

The popular tourist destination had gone without large-scale food aid since the cyclone struck six days ago, and the human cost of the disaster was only now being revealed.

"On the day, it was a terrible thing to live through because it was so strong," said 50-year-old islander Armando Watela, as he cleared up the damage. The storm tore off his roof and punched a door-sized hole in his front wall.

"We couldn't have imagined it would be so strong," he added.

"Some people stayed at home, others went to stay at the fort for shelter, others went around looking for a safe place. Almost everybody lost their belongings. "My pregnant daughter was in a room when the walls started to fall in, so we took the whole family to the fort." His daughter gave birth two days after the cyclone struck and is now recovering in a clinic on the island.

But 7,000 people were trapped in an increasingly desperate situation until World Food Programme helicopters reached the island on Wednesday.

The UN had described the challenges

of reaching areas like Ibo after the cyclone—the first to hit Mozambique's north in the modern era — as 'incredibly difficult'.

The island can only reached by air or boat — a sometimes perilous sea crossing as it is also vulnerable to the elements. And according to initial estimates, 90 per cent of structures there have been damaged. On Wednesday, some residents tended to their mangled or missing roofs, while others sat quietly as a 4X4 delivered packages of high-calorie biscuits. "If somebody hasn't lost everything, he's a lucky guy because no one has escaped," said a motorcycle taxi driver who declined to give his name.



Abdala Moto, who has an extended family of 16, told AFP: "Everything fell and now we are staying in a neighbour's house while we are trying to

rebuild our own." Cyclone Kenneth killed at least 41 people and destroyed thousands of homes across northern Mozambique. *AFP*

Umar kidnapped by gunmen

ABUJA -Alhaji Musa Umar, the husband of Nigerian President Muhammadu Buhari's niece, has been kidnapped by four gunmen in the president's hometown of Daura in Katsina State in northern Nigeria. The Nigerian Guardian reported yesterday that the home of Umar was stormed on Wednesday night by the kidnappers who shot into the air after Umar had just returned from praying at the local mosque and was sitting in front of his house with some guests. Umar is married to the daughter of the president's sister.

Soldier kills 3, commits suicide

NAIROBI - A Kenya Defence Forces soldier has committed suicide after first shooting dead three relatives at Jua Kali area in Eldoret, while another Kenyan man has been remanded after murdering his girlfriend by stabbing her 23 times during several days of violence between family members and intimates, the East African reported. The soldier drove nearly 200 km from Gilgil, Nakuru County, to Eldoret. After reaching his family's home in the early hours of Tuesday morning he opened fire on his two uncles and a woman who lives in the homestead before turning the gun on himself. African News Agency

Congo Ebola cases hit record

EASTERN CONGO - The woman spent more than a week at home sick before family members tried to take her to an Ebola treatment centre in eastern Congo. Before the motorcycle could reach the facility, it was too late. Her crumpled body rested against the driver's back as he worriedly made phone calls, witnesses said. Health experts are expressing growing alarm about the number of people sickened with the Ebola virus who are never reaching treatment centres, allowing the disease to spread to caregivers and countless others. AP

uganda - A new policy will see Uganda maximise the gains from its natural resources. To achieve efficiency and ensure equitable and transparent management of mineral revenues, Kampala will automatically own shares in every mining company granted a lease, according to a new policy approved by the Cabinet this month. Uganda's Mining and Minerals Policy 2018 also makes value addition mandatory. It is aimed at helping the country achieve maximum economic gains from its natural resources.

Venezuela's uprising attempt sputters

CARACAS - Venezuelans heeded opposition leader Juan Guaidó's call to fill streets around the nation Wednesday but security forces showed no sign of answering his cry for a widespread military uprising, instead dispersing crowds with teargas as the political crisis threatened to deepen.

Thousands cheered Guaidó in Caracas, as he rolled up his sleeves and called on Venezuelans to remain out in force and prepare for a general strike, a day after his bold attempt to spark a mass military defection against President Nicolas Maduro failed to tilt the balance of power.

"It's totally clear now the usurper has lost," Guaidó proclaimed, a declaration belied by events on the ground.

Across town at the Carlota air-base near where Guaidó made his plea a day earlier for a revolt, intense clashes raged between protesters and troops loyal to Maduro, making clear the standoff would drag on. There and elsewhere, state security forces launched tear gas and fired rubber bullets while

bands of mostly young men armed with makeshift shields threw rocks and set a motorcycle ablaze.

"I don't want to say it was a disaster, but it wasn't a success," said Marilina Carillo, who was standing in a crowd of anti-government protesters blowing horns and whistles. But only the chief of Venezuela's feared intelligence agency broke ranks, while most others stood steadfast. Some analysts predicted that would make Maduro more emboldened. AFP

THAILAND SET FOR **CORONATION OF KING**

THAILAND - Thailand's King Maha Vajiralongkorn will be crowned this weekend in a pageantry-laden ceremony flecked by Hindu and Buddhist ritual, as Rama X furthers his primacy over one of the world's richest monarchies and a kingdom beset by ulcerous political divides.

The May 4-6 coronation comes more than two years after Vajiralongkom ascended the throne at the death of his father Bhumibol Adulyadej. Bhumibol reigned over seven tumultuous decades and was revered by Thais as a symbol of unity in a politically chaotic country. His fiercely private 66-year-old son Rama X of the Chakri dynasty is less well-known by his subjects, and makes frequent trips overseas. On Saturday at the auspicious hour of 10:09 am the public will be given a rare window into the heart of Thai power as blanket television coverage of the three-day coronation begins.

It will start with King Vajiralongkorn's 'purification' by water drawn from ponds and rivers followed by a presentation of holy water by the top Buddhist patriarch and Chief Brahmin.

Then, as he sits underneath an ornate nine-tiered umbrella inside the Grand Palace, will be handed the diamond-encrusted Great Crown of Victory and issue his first royal command. Timeslive

Nearly 800 000 evacuated in India ahead of storm

INDIA -Nearly 800 000 people in India's eastern coastal districts have been evacuated ahead of the expected arrival of a major cyclone packing winds of up to 200km/h, officials said yesterday.

Tropical Cyclone Fani, brewing in the Bay of Bengal some 450km offshore and moving westwards, is expected to make landfall today afternoon near the Hindu holy town of Puri. A state relief department

official told AFP news agency that 780 000 people were moved to safer places overnight from at least 13 districts of Odisha state that will bear the brunt of the powerful cyclone.

"More people are being moved to safer places," an official from the department told AFP yesterday.

Some 1 000 shelters in schools and government buildings have been set up to accommodate more than a million people. AFP



could be in sight the days ahead. The prime minister is aiming to wrap up the talks next week,

either with agreement or without one. On Wednesday, May signaled she could move on one of her key red lines and allow the UK to sign up to some kind of permanent customs union with the EU. The pound

strengthened. "There is a greater commonality in terms of some of the benefits of a customs union that we've already identified between ourselves and the official opposition," May told a parliamentary committee. "Looking at the balance of these issues is part of the discussion.

Can we come to an agreement on that? I hope we will be able to." May invited Corbyn to work on a cross-party deal last month in a desperate attempt to get an agreement, after the blueprint she negotiated with the European Union was rejected for a third time by Parliament.

With local elections taking place on Thursday, the talks have been low-key this week, but the government is planning one more big meeting on May 7 or 8 to decide whether a consensus with Labour is possible.

For May, the key to any compromise on a customs union is likely to be whether both sides can agree to call it something else. Bloomberg

Services cancelled over bomb fears

SRI LANKA -Sri Lanka's Roman Catholic Church said it had cancelled plans to resume on Sunday services because of fears of fresh bomb attacks. A spokesperson for Cardinal Malcolm Ranjith said yesterday the Church received 'specific information of two possible attacks against churches,' and it was decided to call off the May 5 mass."On the advice of the security forces, we have decided not to have Sunday masses in any of the churches," the spokesperson told AFP. The church had planned to resume public services for the first time since the Easter Sunday attacks that killed 257 people. AFP

Shooter kills 2, wounds 4 at university

CHARLOTTE - The University of North Carolina in Charlotte lifted a campus lockdown on Wednesday morning, a day after a gunman killed two people and wounded four on the school's last day of classes for the semester. Police in Charlotte charged UNC Charlotte student Trystan Andrew Terrell, 22, with two counts of murder and four of attempted murder. Three of the four people he wounded were in a critical condition. They offered no hints as to the suspect's motive and did not identify the victims.

Selfie-crazy teens crushed by train

INDIA -Three teenagers were killed while taking selfies on a railway track in India, the country which researchers say has the worst record for selfie-related deaths. A fourth youth managed to jump to safety before the accident in Panipat city in the northern state of Haryana, a police officer told AFP Wednesday."The victims were busy taking selfies and when they saw a train approaching they jumped to a second track without realising another train was coming on that," M. S. Dabas told AFP."One of them saved his life as he jumped on the other side of the track." AFP

Politician charged after donkey ride

INDIA - Indian police charged a would-be election candidate with animal cruelty Wednesday after he rode a donkey to file his application for the national ballot. Mani Bhushan Sharma, a perennial long-shot candidate, filed his nomination papers on Monday followed by a short donkey ride outside the local election office in Jehanabad town, eastern Bihar state."We have filed a case under prevention of cruelty to animals against the politician," Shree Maneesh, Jehanabad police chief, told AFP.



Semenya made to Suffer - Indian gender-row sprinter

NEW DELHI - Indian gender-row sprinter Dutee Chand yesterday said Caster Semenya's court defeat over testosterone rules was "wrong", but backed the Olympic 800m champion to overcome the potentially far-reaching ruling.

Chand, who fought and won a long battle over her own hyperandrogenism, or elevated levels of male sex hormones, said she felt sorry for the South African star, whose career has been plagued by controversy.

"This is wrong. I feel sad for her, she has been made to suffer like me," Chand, 23, told AFP.

Chand, who was subjected to humiliating gender-testing as a teenager, was finally cleared to compete last year after winning a court appeal against International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) regulations.

Chand successfully challenged the IAAF's stance on hyperandrogenism, prompting the world governing body to change its rules to target only middle-distance events, arguing these were most affected by elevated testosterone.

But on Wednesday, the Court of Arbitration for Sport in Lausanne dismissed Semenya's appeal against the IAAF measures, triggering an angry response in South Africa.

The decision means that women with elevated testosterone will have to take

suppressive treatment if they wish to compete as females in certain events.

To defend her 800m title at the IAAF World Championships in September, Semenya, 28, will now have to take medication, probably including birth control pills. She is now weighing up an appeal.

Chand, who won 100m and 200m silver at last year's Asian Games, her first major event since returning to competition, was hopeful that Semenya's legal team will find a way to succeed.

"It was my legal team that handled her case. The team that fought my case, I handed them over to Caster Semenya," Chand said. "I think she and her team

will find a way out. She is an Olympic medallist and her country is behind her."

The CAS ruling raised several concerns about the IAAF regulations, calling them "discriminatory" and questioning their implementation, as well as the lack of evidence proving an advantage from higher testosterone levels.

"See this (the condition) is natural. To increase and decrease testosterones is not in our hand. Now medical scientists can guide her," said Chand.

"But she is not poor like me and is well known with a lot of money and resources," said Chand, who was born in rural poverty. *AFP*

FIFA ready to discuss concussion substitutions

ZURICH - FIFA is open to having discussions about temporary substitutions if players suffer serious head injuries in matches, its medical committee Head Michel D'Hooghe has told the Times newspaper.

Tottenham Hotspur defender Jan Vertonghen tried to play on following a head clash in Tuesday's Champions League semi-final first leg defeat by Ajax Amsterdam before going off, prompting brain injury charity Headway to call for changes to the rules.

"Introducing substitutes specifically for concussion is a possibility and something worth discussing," D'Hooghe told The Times.

"But if you bring a player off for 10 minutes and they are then reintroduced without warming up properly, it's more likely to lead to muscle injuries... there are problems with that too."

In addition to temporary substitutions, Headway called for "independent doctors with expertise in concussion" to take the final call on whether a player is fit to continue.

However, D'Hooghe believes it would be difficult for independent doctors to assess players.

"The advice from FIFA and UEFA is clear. At every occasion and before every tournament we tell the doctors that they must follow the protocols," he added.

"The team doctors must be responsible for their own players. They know the players and are in a better position to assess whether they have been unconscious, or are in danger."

Vertonghen underwent further assessment on Wednesday and tests would continue for the next few days, Tottenham said.

"We shall also be seeking independent advice and Jan is due to see a neurologist who specialises in elite athletes tomorrow. The player has reported no ill-effects today," the club said on their website. *AFP*

Tiger Woods accepts Trump's invitation WASHINGTON-Tiger Woods to the White House to

WASHINGTON - Tiger Woods is set to visit the White House for a congratulatory reception with President Donald Trump following his victory at the Masters, according to reports in the USA.

Woods earned a stunning onestroke victory at Augusta last month to earn his 15th major championship, his first Masters win since 2005 and his first major victory since the 2008 US Open.

He has played with keen golfer Trump in the past, with the US president posing for a picture with Woods and Jack Nicklaus on course, which was posted to his Twitter account in February.

According to Fox News, Woods will visit Trump at the White House in Washington DC next Monday for a reception.

Trump tweeted his support for Woods during the final round of the Masters on April 14, as the 43-year-old shot a two-under-par 70 to claim a historic victory following years of injuries and personal problems.

The president described Woods as a "great champion", and promised to honour him with the Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Woods' reported White House visit could cause controversy, as several athletes have refused to meet with the president previously. Stephen Curry said he would refuse to attend the traditional presidential welcome for NBA champions after the Golden State Warriors won the 2017 championship. Trump responded by revoking Curry's invite via Twitter, despite no official communication having been made at that point.

Philadelphia Eagles also pulled out of meeting Trump at the last minute following their victory at the 2018 Super Bowl.

Spurs defender Vertonghen to see neurologist

LONDON - Tottenham Hotspur have confirmed Jan Vertonghen is to see a neurologist yesterday after suffering a worrying head injury against Ajax in the Champions League.

The 32-year-old Belgium international had to be helped from the pitch during Tuesday evening's 1-0 Champions League semifinal, first-leg defeat after initially being allowed to play on following lengthy treatment.

Spurs insisted on Wednesday evening that Vertonghen had not lost consciousness after colliding with team-mate Toby Alderweireld as the pair challenged for a high ball, and while they confirmed he had suffered no ill-effects in the 24 hours since, he is to be assessed by a specialist. A statement on the club's official website said: "Jan Vertonghen has undergone further assessment today after sus-

taining a head injury in last night's Champions League semi-final first leg against Ajax. He also suffered a small cut to his nose that was bleeding heavily.

"The Belgium defender was assessed on the pitch yesterday immediately after the incident with our medical team strictly following Football Association concussion guidelines.

"Following testing he was judged to be alert and answered all questions correctly and lucidly, deeming him fit to return to the field of play. "All available video footage was relayed to our on-pitch medical team and they were able to confirm that he had suffered no loss of consciousness. "Jan was immediately withdrawn as a result of the player informing medical staff that symptoms were developing suddenly and that he no longer felt stable standing up."

Fans criticised the 23-year-old forward on social media yesterday after he was filmed watching his team-

mates in the warm-up, holding his hands behind his back and standing with one foot on a ball, while they went through a series of drills.

Martial has been complaining of a bad back, but it is understood Solskjaer was unhappy with the player's blatant lack of effort.

He decided to send on Alexis Sanchez rather than Martial as a replacement for Marcus Rashford in the 65th minute.

There have been concerns over

Martial's attitude since he signed a five-year contract at the end of January.

Having been a regular starter since Solskjaer took over in December, the former Monaco man is now firmly out of favour.

Frustration

Jose Mourinho's frustration with Martial was such that he wanted to sell him last summer, and Solskjaer has become exasperated by the player's approach.

The dressing-room incident took

some of the focus away from goalkeeper David de Gea, whose latest error gifted Chelsea an equaliser.

Solskjaer is expected to stand by De Gea for the remaining two games and teammates have been rallying round the Spaniard.

Romelu Lukaku said: "I don't think we should discredit him and suddenly say he is a bad goalkeeper – he has saved us many times this season. We are here to support him."

Highlanders Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Thulani Khumalo said he was yet to be briefed about the matter when reached for comment yesterday.


